GOVT REQUESTS EXTRA KD 6BN **FOR WEAPONS**

KUWAIT: The government has asked the National Assembly for KD 6.2 billion (\$20.5 billion) in additional funds for defense purchases over the next 10 years, local media and a minister said yesterday. Kuwait is looking to upgrade its firepower amid increased security concerns in the region linked to the rise of the jihadist Islamic State group. The state is a member of the US-led coalition that has been bombing IS targets in Syria and Iraq since last year and is also taking part in a Saudi-led coalition pounding Iran-backed rebels in Yemen. But it is unclear if the additional funds are also linked to that.

State Minister for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah Al-Sabah told reporters a bill has been sent to parliament requesting the additional funds, but he declined to specify the amount. Local dailies Al-Qabas and Al-Rai reported yesterday that the amount is KD 6.2 billion. The Assembly is expected to review the request soon. The government does not publish specific figures for its defense

Several reports have recently linked Kuwait to several arms deals amid regional turmoil. The Eurofighter consortium said in September Kuwait agreed to buy 28 Typhoon warplanes in a deal worth €7-8 billion (\$8-9 billion). Last month, Kuwait signed €2.5 billion (\$2.8 billion) worth of fixed and provisional military deals led by the purchase of 24 Airbus-built Caracal helicopters. Paris said Kuwait would purchase the helicopters for €1.0 billion, with an option for a further six. Further deals included provision of French light armored vehicles and patrol boat maintenance. —AFP

MPS BLAST DOW DEAL AS 'THEFT OF CENTURY'

GOVT TO KEEP SELLING STAKES IN FIRMS

KUWAIT: MPs yesterday began a debate over a highly controversial deal with US firm Dow Chemical, which resulted in Kuwait being ordered to pay a huge \$2.2 billion penalty. The Assembly agreed to continue the debate today to allow more

MPs to talk on the multibillion-dollar deal amid allegations of conspiracy, corruption and theft. Kuwait was ordered to pay the fine after it unilaterally scrapped the joint venture deal with Dow in late 2008 following a political dispute between the government and the then opposition lawmakers.

FRENCH COURT RULES ON GADDAFI'S PLANE

PERPIGNAN, France: A French court yesterday lifted a freeze order on slain Libyan strongman Muammar Gaddafi's personal plane, following a bitter battle over the luxury aircraft between a Kuwaiti conglomerate and the Libyan government. Kuwait's Al-Kharafi group had the Airbus A340, seen as a symbol of Gaddafi's extravagance by the rebels who overthrew him, seized amid a near billion-euro debt related to a contract to build a beach resort in Libya.

The plane has been in the southern French city of Perpignan since 2012, soon after Gaddafi's regime fell, where it had been sent for three million euros' worth of maintenance work by Air France - as yet unpaid. "It is very satisfying to see the judge has recognized the fact this plane, which belongs to the Libyan state, has immunity from being seized," said Carole

Sportes, lawyer for the Libyan side.

In 2006 Al-Kharafi signed a contract with the Gaddafi regime to build a beach resort on Libya's Mediterranean coast, which it was to run for 90 years, but Tripoli cancelled the deal unilaterally in 2010. A Cairo court in 2013 ruled Al-Kharafi was owed €935 million over the broken contract and the company had the plane seized as part of efforts to recover the money.

Since Gaddafi was killed in oil-rich Libya's 2011 uprising, the country has slid into chaos, with the Islamic State group making inroads. Libya has had two administrations since Aug 2014, when a militia alliance overran the capital and set up its own parliament in Tripoli while forcing the internationally recognized government to take refuge in Tobruk, in the east. — AFP

ISLAMISTS, IS LEADER'S EX-WIFE RELEASED IN SWAP

US SPECIAL OPS TO FIGHT IS MILITANTS

WASHINGTON: The United States will deploy special operations forces to fight Islamic State jihadists in Iraq, with the ability to conduct raids over the border in Syria, Defense Secretary Ashton Carter said yesterday. Speaking to the House Armed Services Committee, the Pentagon chief said a "specialized expeditionary targeting force" would be deployed to help Iraqi and Kurdish peshmerga forces battle the IS group. He did not say how many troops would be involved.

The special forces will also be able to intervene in neighboring northern Syria, where Washington previously announced it is sending about 50 special operations troops in a non-combat role. "These special operators will over time be able to conduct raids, free hostages,

gather intelligence, and capture ISIL leaders," he said. "This force will also be in a position to conduct unilateral operations into Syria."

President Barack Obama has said the United States would not send large-scale, "boots on the ground" deployments of American troops to fight IS jihadists, and instead would intensify its air campaign against the group. In late October, Obama authorized sending about 50 special operations forces to Syria in a non-combatant, advisory role to help coordinate local ground troops and anti-IS coalition efforts. This marked the first official deployment of US troops on the ground in Syria since an international coalition formed last year to counter the jihadist group.

Carter said the Pentagon is "prepared to expand" the role of these troops in Syria. "American special operators bring a unique suite of capabilities that make them force multipliers," Carter said.

BEIRUT: Al-Qaeda's Syrian wing freed 16 Lebanese soldiers and policemen yesterday in exchange for the release of jailed Islamists including the ex-wife of Islamic State leader Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi. The Nusra Front seized the Lebanese 16 months ago during an attack on the Lebanese border town of Arsal mounted together with the Islamic State jihadist group which is still believed to be holding

nine soldiers captured in the incursion. The exchange, brokered by Qatar, cast new light on the Gulf state's channels to the Nusra Front, a powerful player in the Syrian civil war that has been designated a terrorist group by the United Nations and United States. Live TV footage from an area between Lebanon and Syria showed the Lebanese captives in vehicles accompanied by masked men armed with assault rifles and waving the Nusra Front flag before they were released to the Red Cross.

Thirteen Islamists in Lebanese jails, including Saja Al-Dulaimi, the ex-wife of Baghdadi, were also released. Dulaimi, fully

veiled, was shown in live TV footage from the area with her four children who were with her in prison. Nusra Front fighters were shown kissing and hugging the sons of Dulaimi, who was arrested by the Lebanese authorities a year ago. Speaking to Al Jazeera, she said her wish was to return to Beirut and then to leave to Turkey.

"We accomplished the entire agreement with Nusra. We received our heroic soldiers and we are on our way back to Beirut," top Lebanese security official Abbas Ibrahim, who oversaw the swap, told Reuters by telephone. "This joy not complete until the return of those kidnapped by Daesh. We are ready to negotiate with Daesh if we find someone to negotiate with," he said. Daesh is an Arabic name for Islamic State.

The Nusra Front fighters chanted "God is Great" as they arrived with the captives in preparation for the swap. One of the captives, interviewed by Al Jazeera, said the group had treated them well.





VISA SUSPENSION FROM **KUWAIT ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION: AMBASSADOR**

KUWAIT: Ambassador of Switzerland to Kuwait Aldo de Luca said yesterday that the suspension of the visa issuance from Kuwait is "purely administrative" and does not entail for residents of Kuwait any necessity whatsoever to travel to Qatar in order to submit their visa applications.

Swiss Embassy's visa section has closed down and that the processing of visa applications through its services is discontinued as of Dec 1, 2015, he said. The visa application center previously located in the premises of the Embassy will remain in Kuwait and will be subcontracted to the company "VFS", whose counters are located in Al-Qibla area, Kuwait City, de Luca said in statement to KUNA.

The authority henceforth in charge of issuing visas for residents of the State of Kuwait is the Embassy of Switzerland in Doha. Qatar, and the move had already been advertised in the local media twice in the past few days, he said.

The VFS Company in Kuwait has committed itself to swiftly handle the transmission of visa applications to the Embassy of Switzerland in Doha in an immediate and confidential manner, thereby guaranteeing the protection of personal data, he

This change is part of a comprehensive reorganization of Switzerland's diplomatic and consular representation network worldwide, according to the Swiss ambassador, who added that similar moves in Kuwait and in other parts of the world are mainly designed to cut costs and eliminate inefficiencies.

He also stressed the need to ensure effectiveness and ease of travel to its territory in an increasingly globalized world, Switzerland is streamlining its procedures in order to respond to a continuous rise of the number of visa applications which, without the necessary streamlining measures, would entail even lengthier processing times and delays.

The Swiss authorities are confident that the changes will work to the satisfaction of the customers of the country's Embassies worldwide. The Embassy of Switzerland in Kuwait will continue to actively promote business contacts between both countries and looks forward to an increase in the number of visitors and tourists from Kuwait to Switzerland, Ambassador de Luca concluded. — KUNA

KUWAIT FOLLOWS AMBITIOUS PLAN TO PRESERVE CULTURAL HERITAGE: MINISTER

KUWAIT: The urban and architectural modernity in the Arab World have been suffering negligence for decades, Minister of Information and Minister of State for Youth Affairs Sheikh Salman Sabah Salem Al-Humoud Al-Sabah said. This is why Kuwait is working in line with an ambitious plan to preserve its cultural heritage, Sheikh Salman told the opening of an international conference that kicked off yesterday.

The three-day conference is organized by Kuwait's National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters (NCCAL) in cooperation with the UNESCO's World Heritage Centre under the main theme of safeguarding the heritage of urban and architectural modernity in the Arab World.

The event aims to set executive work programs and launch innovative initiatives to preserve the copious cultural heritage in the Arab countries, Sheikh Salman said. He added that the NCCAL was able in cooperation with the UNESCO's World Heritage Centre to add Sheikh Abdullah

Al-Jaber, Failaka Island and Kuwait Towers to the UNESCO tentative list to become World Heritage sites.

Sheikh Salman lauded UNESCO efforts, in collaboration with other organizations, to broaden the international agreements on promoting knowledge and encouraging scientific research as well as advising governments on preservation of national urban and cultural heritage. In 1960. Kuwait issued the first law on antiquities in the Gulf area, to regulate excavations and protect monuments, in a bid to preserve the country's cultural heritage, the minister

Meanwhile, Director of the UNESCO's World Heritage Centre Mechtild Rossler said that protecting cultural heritage for future generations is preservation of civilization. Rossler added that heritage preservation aims to maintain the identity of each region, pointing to the significance participation of universities and urban and civil institutions in the conference. — KUNA

Romanian embassy celebrates national day

KUWAIT: Security forces in Kuwait and Romania established a high level coordination in order to locate Kuwaiti citizen Mohammad Al-Baghli who went missing in the European country earlier this

year, a Kuwaiti official said yesterday, stressing that security delegations from both countries had exchanged visits for this reason. The Foreign Minister's Assistant for Ceremonial Affairs Dhari Al-Ajran made that statement during a ceremony organized by the Romanian Embassy in Kuwait to

celebrate its national day, during which he hailed the strong bilateral relations between the two countries.

Climate

Commenting on Kuwait's participation in the climate conference in Paris, Ajran said that both His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah and His Highness the Prime Minister were invited, but His Highness the Amir had other obligations that prevented him from attending. He also stressed that Kuwait is highly concerned with

environmental issues. On his part, the Romanian Ambassador to Kuwait Vasile Sofineti strongly hailed both countries' historic and cordial relations, noting that Kuwait was the first GCC state to forge diplomatic relations with Romania on June 10, 1963.

KD 43 MILLION COURTHOUSE TO BE COMPLETED BY 2017

KUWAIT: A Ministry of Public Works official announced yesterday that 18 percent of construction for the Hawally Courts Complex has been completed, with the project costing KD 43 million (\$141 million). In a press statement, spokesman for the Ministry of Public Works and Assistant Undersecretary of Planning and Development Abdulmohsen Khaled Al-Enezi revealed that the grand project consists of a courts complex and a multistorey parking lot. The courts complex covers 13000 square meters, featuring 52 courtrooms, Enezi added.

The administrative section of the complex will be built on 39,000 square meters to accommodate 1334 employees, Enezi announced. The parking lot, equipped with maximal security measures, contains 1200 parking spots, he added.

Moreover, Enezi revealed that the courts complex contains 25 floors, three basements, a ground floor and a mezzanine while the parking lot would have three basements, a ground floor, a mezzanine and five floors. The entire complex stretches on 9000 square meters while the construction site is 121,924 square meters. The contract for the project is estimated to cost around KD 43 million. The complex, once finished, is expected to be one of the country's landmark buildings, he said, adding that the estimated date of completion is tentatively set for January 31, 2017. — KUNA


KIB SUPPORTS ENGINEERING AND PETROLEUM COLLEGE STUDENTS

Apartment fire

Salmiya and South Salmiya technical rescue responded and began evacuation of the building, and six persons including an 8-month-old infant suffered smoke inhalation and were taken to hospital in stable condition.



Warehouse fire

Fire broke out in education ministry warehouses in Subhan in an uncovered area of 6,000 square meters, while the fire was in an area of 200 square meters. The fire was contained and kept from spreading in a record time by fire centers from Subhan, Mubarak Al-Kabeer and backup.

Contrabands possession

An Egyptian man was taken to the Drug Control General Directorate (DCGD) for trading in drugs. A police patrol noticed the suspect on foot between buildings in Mahboula. He did not have an ID with him, so he was searched and 500 grams of heroin as well as six tablets were found with him. He also was found wanted by residency affairs detectives. Meanwhile, Capital security campaigns resulted in the arrest of three men with liquor, and they were in an abnormal condition. When police went to their house, they discovered liquor making equipment there. Separately, a Kuwaiti and his companion were caught under the influence of drugs. They had 200 illicit tablets in addition to other substances and drug paraphernalia.

Fugitives caught

A Kuwaiti man was caught in Bneid Al-Gar and found wanted on a KD 1,125 debt, while another in Rawda was wanted for a KD 700 debt. Also, a Filipina was also arrested over a KD 480 debt.

COURT ADJOURNS ABDALI CELL SESSION TO DEC 8

KUWAIT: The Criminal Court, chaired by Judge Mohammad Al-Duaij, yesterday adjourned its session on case number 55/2015 on the Abdali terrorist cell with 26 defendants to December 8, to

hear the final testimony. In a closed-door session on November 5, the court listened to the testimony of defense witnesses. Two days earlier, 3 November, the court listened to testimony of the Public Prosecution, in a session that was turned into a closed-door one. Earlier, on 21 October, the court listened in a closed-door session to the testi-

mony of medical examiners. On a session dated 13 October, the court listened to testimony of ballistic officer. On October 6th, the tribunal listened to the criminal inspection officer in a closed-door session. On October 4th, it refused to release defendants and listened to the State Security officer, who was summoned to testify in a closed-door

Meanwhile, the court released four of the accused on a KD 500 bail each with a travel ban on them, compelling the defendants to attend next sessions. Some 26 people are charged in the case, all Kuwaitis, except for an Iranian.

The first hearing in the case was convened on 15 September. The Public Prosecution had called for pre-trial detention of all the suspects, accused of carrying out hostile acts against the State of Kuwait, furtive contacts with Iran and Hezbollah and the possession of firearms, guns, ammunition and tapping devices. — KUNA

KUWAIT AGGRIEVED PARTY IN LAWSUITS AGAINST RAJA'AN

AUTHORITY SEEKS AID TO REGULATE PORTS

KUWAIT: The Public Institution for Social Security (PIFSS) has asked the Swiss Public Prosecutor to consider PIFSS as an aggrieved party in the court case against the former director of PIFSS Fahad Al-Raja'an, Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister and Acting Oil Minister Anas Al-Saleh said during yesterday's parliament

There is a commitment from the Kuwaiti Public Prosecution to pursue the matter of recouping public funds from the absconding former director of PIFSS, in concert with the Fatwa and Legislation Department which has been entrusted by the government to retrieve these stolen public funds, said Saleh. He added that PIF-SS has been instructed to provide the Fatwa and Legislation Dept. with all documents necessary and to contact attorneys' offices abroad to pursue lawsuits against Al-Raja'an for the purpose of recovering stolen public funds from him.

Meanwhile, Minister Communications and Minister of State for Municipal Affairs Essa Al-Kandari said that Kuwait Ports Authority (KPA) has primarily approved using the aid of international companies to resolve issues in the field. The Ministry of Interior and the

Ministry of Social Affairs are coordinating with the General Administration of Customs to study and resolve the ships traffic jam in ports, Kandari said during the session.

Saleh noted meanwhile that the Audit Bureau requested implementing regulations on uninhabited lands and monitor the violations at these locations. In the same context, Minister of Public Works and Minister of State for National Assembly Affairs Ali Al-Omair said that the government has responded to 85 percent of parliamentary questions. He added that the government answered 2007 out of 2373 questions. — KUNA

MUNICIPALITY HEAD'S RESIGNATION ACCEPTED

KUWAIT: Well-informed Cabinet sources yesterday announced that Kuwait Municipality Director Ahmed Al-Subaih's resignation was accepted after he was appointed secretary general of the Arab Cities Organization. The sources said that Subaih had submitted his resignation to Minister of State for Municipal Affairs Essa Al-Kandari, who referred it to the Cabinet for approval. The sources added that the most prominent nominee to succeed Subaih was his assistant for urban organization Ahmad Al-Manfouhi, who currently serves as acting municipality director.

Saadoun slams politicians

Former parliament speaker Ahmad Al-Saadoun said that boycotting the parliamentary elections helped 'uncover corrupt individuals' and debunk the idea that the former opposition was responsible for obstructing development in the country.

"Political movements that claim to be seeking reform must not cooperate and coordinate with those who are corrupt," Saadoun said in a press statement. "Political forces that are supposed to be reformist should not open means of communications with the elements of corruption."

The veteran oppositionist further revealed that a 'closed-door meeting' took place recently featuring "politicians who think they are smart enough by taking advantage of others," adding that they are audio recordings available for what have been said during the meeting.

Trafficker sentenced to death

The criminal court yesterday sentenced an expatriate man to death over charges of drug trafficking, said security sources, noting that the suspect was found guilty of importing and possessing drugs for trade.

'Huge rats'

Reports of 'huge rats' have been seen in various areas of Dasma and Daiya yesterday morning. Residents in both areas reported seeing huge Norwegian rats 'invading the streets' in broad daylight, and even attacking kittens and puppies.

ROADS FLOODED IN SABAHIYA

KUWAIT: Roads of Sabahiya were flooded with brackish water following an explosion at a pump. A security source said citizens reported to police that a brackish water pump exploded and flooded streets in the area. A team from water emergency along with fire and policemen dealt with the problem and repaired the damage.

Laser face treatment burn

A citizen lodged a medical error complaint against a Filipina woman that works in a medical center, claiming the lady caused burns to her face and neck during a laser session. The suspect was arrested. The citizen told Salmiya police that she went for a laser session in a Salmiya center where a Filipina burned her. The Filipina is being questioned.

Woman beats citizen

An Ethiopian woman exchanged blows with a 22year-old citizen when he offered her money for sex, and she lodged a complaint at Nugra police station. A security source said the woman told police that a young man offered her money for sex, and when she refused he insulted her verbally, so she beat him, then after an exchange of blows he escaped in his car, and she gave police the license plate number. The young man was arrested and investigation is underway.

Jahra crackdown

Jahra policemen launched security campaigns to root out reckless individuals who remain in front of girls schools, and violators in Kabd animal pens. A security source said that five vehicles were impounded and 27 traffic violations were recorded. Meanwhile in Kabd 39 violators were arrested as well as eight without IDs. They are being sent to concerned authorities.

Debtor arrested

Capital police arrested a wanted citizen for the civil implementation department over a KD 59,000 debt. A patrol in Rawdha suspected the man so they checked his ID and was found wanted. — Al-Rai

25,000 HOUSING APPLICATIONS REVIEWED, COULD BE CANCELED

KUWAIT: The Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW) may filter housing applications, which have reached 107,000, based on a proposal by the parliamentary housing committee that called for reviewing the applications. Informed sources said there is a possibility that 25,000 applications (23 percent) may be removed because they violate housing care rules and regulations, adding that most of the applications fall under the "divorced without children category".

They said the parliamentary committee called for finding a compromise between the HCA and Justice Ministry over information about divorce cases in courts, and indicate whether there are children or not, then the application may be frozen and referred to concerned authorities to make sure whether the applicant deserves

Sources said the current situation of applications is numerically inaccurate and contains a large number of divorcees without children, and other cases such as those with dual citizenship, or whose nationalities were revoked. They said the intention is to cancel the application instead of freezing it, because freezing allows the applicant to take advantage of the date of applying based on his first marriage. —Al-Qabas

STRANGE WATER AND STRANGER POWDER

had a skin rash in the groin area a few days ago, and nothing I was given as treatment worked. Also, as I was abroad away from my doctor, I used talcum powder, and its use helped me bear with my dilemma until I returned home. 

The powder is used in medicine, soap manufacturing, cosmetics and many other things, and is manufactured from magnesium silicate with a complex chemical formula that is characterized by being highly absorbent. Despite the widespread use of this substance, it has side effects on those who have breathing problems, because its light ingredients rise during application and cause allergy to many. It was also medically proven that some women got ovarian cancer due to the use of this powder at a certain age, or because of its use in deodorants.

Because the metallic formula of talcum powder, it is difficult for the body to get rid of what is absorbed into the body, and causes infections or things more dangerous than this. So we advise caution when this powder is used, and avoid breathing whatever flies from it. Women should not use it, and there may be ways or other similar material that is safer. — Translated by Kuwait Times

OBAMA TELLS RUSSIA, TURKEY TO FOCUS ON IS

OBAMA STRESSES US SUPPORT FOR NATO ALLY TURKEY

BRUSSELS: US President Barack Obama led calls yesterday for Turkey and Russia to end their dispute over the downing of a Russian fighter jet and focus instead on Islamic State, the real enemy. NATO chief Jens Stoltenberg urged key ally Turkey and Russia to change tack and find ways to avoid a repeat of an incident which threatens to scupper efforts to forge a common front against IS after the group's attacks in Paris left 130 dead. Obama was frank about what both sides should do. "I want to be very clear: Turkey is a NATO ally. The US supports Turkish rights to defend itself and its airspace and its territory," Obama said after meeting his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan in Paris. "We all have a common enemy and that is ISIL and I want to make sure we focus on that threat," Obama said, using an alternative name for IS.

Erdogan, who has demanded that Russian President Vladimir Putin provide evidence to back up charges Ankara trades in oil with IS, said he too was keen to move on. "We are always willing to resort to the diplomatic language (...) we want to avoid the tensions," he said. Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu meanwhile said Russia should re-establish communication channels instead of making "baseless accusations" that Ankara shot down the jet to keep hidden oil deals with IS which help fund the group's deadly activities. "We should sit at the table and discuss what to do instead of making baseless accusations," Davutoglu said in Ankara.

NATO Urges Calm, De-Escalation

For his part, Stoltenberg said: "The focus now should be on how we can de-escalate and calm tensions (and find) mechanisms so that we can avoid the type of incident we saw last week." He was speaking at the start of a two-day NATO foreign ministers meeting which will review measures adopted by the alliance after the Ukraine crisis to upgrade readiness levels and reassure nervous eastern Europe members who were once ruled from Moscow that the alliance will stand by them.

Stoltenberg says the changes apply globally in what he described as a "dark" security environment, with concerns over Syria looming large. He said US-led NATO has supported Turkey in the past and would announce fresh measures shortly but stressed they were not linked to the downing of the Russian jet along the Syrian border. Washington and its allies fear the Turkey-Russia standoff could undercut efforts to reach a political solution to the crisis in Syria, where Moscow backs long-time ally President Bashar al-Assad and Ankara the rebels seeking to oust him.

Obama, Putin Conciliatory Tone


Obama met Putin on Monday on the sidelines of the climate summit in Paris. "President Obama expressed his regret for the recent loss of a Russian pilot and crew member," a White House official said after their closeddoor meeting. Turkey has returned to Russia the body of snubbed a request by Erdogan to meet on the sidelines the pilot killed when his plane was shot down by the Turkish air force on Nov 24 for allegedly violating its airspace along the Syrian border.

Putin said separately he believed "the decision to shoot down our plane was dictated by the desire to protect the oil supply lines to Turkish territory, right to the ports where it is loaded onto tankers." He had earlier

of the UN climate conference in Paris. "A claim is made through evidence. If there's such evidence, then put it on the table and we will look," Erdogan shot back. If the allegations were proved true, then he would resign, the president said. Ankara has also ruled out making an apology demanded by Moscow. Russia on Monday laid out more details of retaliatory economic sanctions

aimed at denting Turkey's key tourism and agricultural sectors. It will halt fruit and vegetable imports from Turkey after Putin signed a decree banning charter flights and the sale of package holidays, and scrapping Russia's visa-free regime with Ankara. Russia has also boosted its military presence in Syria, deploying toprange S400 missiles and new naval forces in support of Assad. — AFP

ASSAD ALLY MAY BE LEBANON'S NEXT PRESIDENT

BEIRUT: Lebanon's political crisis has taken a dramatic turn with the possibility that a friend of Syrian President Bashar al-Assad could become president in a power-sharing deal aimed at breathing life back into the paralyzed state. The idea of Suleiman Franjieh, a childhood friend of Assad, becoming head of state has taken aback many Lebanese, not least because of who tabled it: Saad al-Hariri, a Sunni politician who leads an alliance forged from opposition to Syrian influence in Lebanon. He would become prime minister under the deal.

It is no less startling because of the backing it would require from Saudi Arabia and Iran, rival states that wield decisive influence over Lebanon's competing factions and which are in conflict elsewhere in the region, including in Syria. As the war escalates in Syria, with Iran and Saudi Arabia increasing their support for Assad and his enemies, a new deal for Lebanon seems unlikely to signal any broader understanding to settle regional conflicts.

But it would point to a desire to preserve a minimal degree of stability in Lebanon. While badly affected by the Syrian war that has triggered militant attacks, driven a million refugees over the border, and fuelled a political crisis, Lebanon has avoided the kind of civil strife some had feared. Yet the country has been without a president for 18 months and a unity government led by Prime Minister Tammam Salam is barely functioning. The Hariri proposal is the most serious effort yet to resolve that political stalemate.

Ali Akbar Velayati, a top adviser to Iran's supreme leader who was on a visit to Beirut on Monday said after meeting Salam that hopes for the election of a president had increased. "We hope to witness in the immediate future the selection and election of a president of the republic," a statement from Salam's office quoted Velayati as saying. But the appointment of Franjieh faces big challenges including resistance from politicians who campaigned against Syrian influence in Lebanon, and winning over other leaders who also covet the post reserved for a Maronite Christian, notably Michel Aoun and Samir Geagea. If it fails, analysts believe the chances of a settlement will be even more remote, meaning no imminent end to a crisis of government that has in recent months left trash to pile up in the streets and the army

Christian Rivalries

Though the proposal has not been made public by Hariri, it has been reported in Lebanon and confirmed by political sources. Franjieh has said the proposal for him to become president is serious, but not official. The deal is expected to include an agreement on arrangements for new parliamentary elections. Any power-sharing deal needs to reconcile Lebanon's two main camps: the March 8 alliance dominated by the Iranian-backed Shi'ite group Hezbollah, and the Hariri-led March 14 alliance.

The toughest part is winning over other Christians on both sides. Geagea and Aoun are the official candidates of the rival alliances, and a Franjieh presidency risks exacerbating historic rivalries among the Christians. Hezbollah has repeatedly stated its support for the candidacy of Aoun, 80, its ally since 2006 and head of the biggest Christian bloc in parliament. Yet Franjieh, whose ties to the group are much older, may be a preferable choice for the group as Hezbollah wages war in Syria in support of

By backing Franjieh, Hariri meanwhile risks fracturing the March 14 alliance which was forged a decade ago out of opposition to Syria in the wake of the assassination of his father. Rafiq Al-Hariri. "The ones with a positive view of this settlement argue that a Franjieh presidency will reassure March 8 and Hezbollah, while the presence of Hariri in the palace as prime minister will reassure the other camp. This is what is being marketed behind the scenes," said Nabil Boumonsef, a political commentator. "There has already been great damage, particularly in the March 14 camp - more than in March 8 - because Franjieh is the clearest ally of the Syrian regime and the Assad family in Lebanon," Boumonsef said. Hezbollah was meanwhile like "a father being asked to choose between two sons", he added.

Hunting With Basil Al-Assad

Franjieh's ties to the Assad family date to his childhood when his grandfather, the late President Suleiman Franjieh, took him on trips to Damascus to visit his friend, the late President Hafez Al-Assad. Franjieh used to hunt with Bashar al-Assad's older brother, Basil, who died in a 1994 car crash. He was orphaned in 1978 when a Christian militia attacked his family home in northern Lebanon, killing his father, mother and sister. Geagea has been accused of responsibility for that civil wartime attack, though he has denied participating.

Franjieh, 50, featured prominently in the period of Syrian domination of Lebanon that followed the 1975-90 war, serving as a government minister several times. That era ended

with the withdrawal of Syrian forces from Lebanon in 2005 following an international outcry at the Rafik al-Hariri assassination. Franjieh was serving as interior minister at the

Hariri, 45, assumed the mantle of Lebanon's most influential Sunni politician after his father's death. He left Lebanon in 2011 after his government was toppled by the March 8 coalition. He has made only two, short trips to Lebanon since then. Boutros Harb, a March 14 politician with presidential ambitions, said he had no personal problem with Franjieh. "But will he bring Bashar Al-Assad with him to Baabda Palace, or will he be president for all Lebanese?" he asked on Twitter. Baabda is the location of the presidential palace.

Speaking last week, a senior figure in Hariri's Future Movement, his cousin Ahmad Al-Hariri, said the only choice for Lebanese was a "brave settlement" to end the repercussions of political "obstruction" which he said had turned into a time bomb, the Hariri-owned Al-Mustaqbal newspaper reported. Franjieh's candidacy would certainly be welcomed by Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri, a powerful Hezbollah ally who heads the Shiite Amal Movement and whose fractious relationship with Aoun is no secret. — Reuters

SMALL STEPS FOR SAUDI WOMEN, DEMOCRACY

Women to vote for first time in local poll

RIYADH: Saudi Arabian women are running for election and voting for the first time on Dec. 12, but their enfranchisement marks only a pigeon step towards democracy and gender equality in the autocratic Islamic kingdom. "For 10 years, since men first voted, we have waited for this chance," said Fawzia Al-Harbi, one of hundreds of female candidates who began campaigning this week. "Now they have given it to us I decided I have the ability to do it."

Fully veiled apart from her eyes and hands and with male chaperones at her side, she met potential voters in a Riyadh shopping mall. Only a fraction of them actually will go to the polls however, and the councils they will choose will have little power. The ruling Al Saud dynasty has no intention of sharing power with elected politicians, say analysts, and it fears combative campaigns or rapid social reform could unleash unrest in a patriarchal state with deep tribal and religious loyalties.

While top princes privately discuss the possibility of eventual elections for the Shura Council, the appointed parliament that discusses new laws and advises the government on legislation, it is still seen as a distant prospect. But political liberalization is edging forward, pressed by a powerful business class that supports modernization and the growing number of educated and working women and their families, and prodded by Western allies.

"The Al Saud recognize the need for change. They started with the municipal elections. Now it is for a majority of seats and they let women vote. They don't discuss it publicly, but in private they talk about elections for the Shura Council," said Khaled Al-Dakhil, a Saudi political scientist. The introduction of women into public life and gradual moves towards electoral politics were won in the face of stiff opposition from the religious establishment - the conservative clerics upon whose support the Al Saud rely for legitimacy. While the clergy has always - eventually - gone along with reforms pushed by the Al Saud, its opposition has sometimes legitimized a conservative backlash, such as the riots that followed the introduction of girls' educa-

Opening the Door to Evil

In Saudi Arabia's gender segregated society, campaigning is difficult. The owners of the mall, one of the only public spaces in Harbi's electoral district, were worried the religious police would complain if she spoke to men. As her male campaign team, a social networking and website company she found online, negotiated with the management, Harbi stood at the end of the corridor, observing social proprieties.

Saudi Arabia is the only country to bar women from driving and requires them to have a male "guardian" who can stop them travelling, marrying, working or having some medical procedures. The Grand Mufti, the most senior cleric, wrote in a web posting in 2011 shortly before the late King Abdullah announced women would take part in this election that allowing women to participate in politics was "opening the door

However, Abdullah appointed 30 women to join the 150-member Shura Council in early 2013 and their participation in discussions has put difficulties faced by women on the agenda, said one of them, speaking anonymously. One recent proposal would allow mothers, as well as fathers, to get a document necessary to register births and to enrol children in schools, approve medical procedures and perform other basic tasks that now need the approval of a man. It has been approved for formal study, said the council member.

No Political Parties

This year's national election differs from the two run in 2005 and 2011 by giving voters the power to elect two thirds of council members instead of half. However, political parties remain banned and, in a sign of how far the Al Saud want to keep any whiff of national or ideological politics from the poll, several candidates with histories of activism have been barred from running.

Candidates are not allowed to deploy religious or tribal symbolism, cannot use their photographs on election material, and are barred from working together. They campaign purely on the basis of published biographies and promises on local issues. What alarms the Al Saud is the emergence of any recognizable bloc, such as Islamists affiliated with the Muslim Brotherhood, that could challenge its power, or that campaigns would push divisive tribal, religious or social issues. An Islamist activist, who did not want to be named, dismissed the councils as being so insignificant that the vote did not warrant the term 'election'. "Is this going to change power? We need a real election," he

Democracy

One place where the performance of elected councils has been particularly watched is Qatif, the only municipal district where a big majority of residents are Shiites, Saudi Arabia's minority sect that has long complained of discrimination. Jafar Al-Shayab, a Shiite who was elected to the Qatif council in 2005, and was then appointed as its leader in 2011, said it had had mixed success in meeting voter expectations.

While it had created a new channel for communication between citizens and the government, and given a measure of oversight of the municipality, which is a main provider of state services, entrenched bureaucracy made it hard to get things done, he said. He cited the example of efforts to coordinate public works for Qatif residents tired of roads being dug up by different departments on successive weeks. "They failed to do anything in that regard," he said. On the other hand, the council did help persuade the government to deal with Qatif independently instead of treating it as part of Eastern Province. That helped it gain a bigger budget and more control of spending, he said.

The relative lack of powers is evident in the low number of Saudis who have registered to vote. Of a population of 20 million, 1.74 million men have registered and only 130,000 women. Of the 7,000 candidates cleared to run, 978 are women. Outside the mall, Harbi approached a family group of five women and spoke about local problems, her plans to open family centres and improve services, and the experience that had led her to stand. They listened, laughed and entered into the discussion. But when asked if they had registered to vote, they said no. — Reuters

DEATH ROW CLERIC IN 'HIGH SPIRITS'

DUBAI: Saudi death row Shiite cleric Nimr Al-Nimr is in high spirits despite reports he is at risk of imminent execution, his brother said on Monday after visiting the sheikh. "He's good, very well, high spirits. His health is very good and he is ready for anything, even for death," Jaffar Al-Nimr told AFP. The brother spoke after he and several other family members, including Nimr's mother, spent about one hour with him at Al-Hair prison near Riyadh. Nimr was a driving force behind protests that erupted in 2011 in eastern Saudi Arabia, where most of the Shiite minority live.

The protests developed into a call for equality in the Sunni-ruled kingdom, where many Shiites have complained of marginalization. Amnesty International said on Thursday that he was among six Shiite activists at imminent risk of execu-

tion who were "clearly convicted in unfair trials". The London-based human rights group said the six were among a total of 50 people who could soon be put to death in a single day. Media "close to the Saudi Arabian authorities" had reported on the execution plans, Amnesty said.

Nimr is not concerned by those stories, his brother said, accusing the interior ministry of sometimes issuing reports in order to gauge public reaction. But Nimr's family are still "very worried," he said. Among the other activists who Amnesty said are at risk of imminent execution is Nimr Al-Nimr's nephew Ali Al-Nimr, who was 17 when he was arrested following the protests for reform. Ali Al-Nimr is also detained at Al-Hair prison, and his father is to visit him in three weeks, Jaffar Al-Nimr said. — AFP

ISRAELI TROOPS KILL TWO PALESTINIANS

JERUSALEM: Two Palestinians attempted to stab an Israeli soldier and a pedestrian in separate attacks near Jewish settlements in the West Bank yesterday, authorities said, but both attackers were shot dead. The incidents came a in the 1990s under the landmark Oslo accords. Netanyahu and Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas shared a rare handshake at a global climate conference in Paris, but no substantial talks were reported.

Yesterday's first incident occurred near the Gush Etzion bloc of settlements south of Jerusalem, the site of a series of recent attacks. A Palestinian brandishing a knife attempted to stab a pedestrian at a junction near the settlement bloc and was shot dead by an Israeli soldier, police and the army said. The Palestinian health ministry identified the dead Palestinian as 16-year-old Mamoon Raed Muhammed Al-Khateeb. Later in the day, in the northern West Bank, a young Palestinian woman who sought to stab a soldier near the Israeli settlement of Einav was shot and killed by the serviceman, the army said. Palestinian police sources identified her as 19-year-old Maram Hassouna, a university student in Nablus who had previously served two years in prison for another attempted knife attack. Violence since Oct 1 has left 103 dead on the Palestinian side, including an Arab Israeli, as well as 17 Israelis, an American and an Eritrean. The stabbings, shootings and car rammings have mainly been carried out by "lone wolf" attackers who have defied calls for peaceful resistance to Israel's occupation. Many of them have been young people, including teenagers, reflecting anger and lost hope over Israel's occupation, the Palestinians' fractured leadership and the complete lack of progress in peace efforts, analysts say.

Handshake But No Talks

The international community has repeatedly called for moves to reduce tensions but Netanyahu has vowed to step up punitive measures and has accused Palestinian leaders of inciting violence. The Palestine Liberation Organisation's secretary general, Saeb Erekat, has said that it could soon move forward on changing longstanding links with Israel, including security coordination, if Netanyahu's gov-

ernment does not take steps toward peace. There has been speculation that such moves could lead to the collapse of the Palestinian Authority, the governing administration set up

al climate summit, Netanyahu told Israeli reporters that he did not want to see the collapse of the Palestinian Authority as it could further empower Palestinian hardliners, such as Islamist movement Hamas. The Palestinian Authority is dominated by Abbas' Fatah party. "The fact that there's now a bad alternative (the PA) doesn't mean that we won't get a worse alternative," Israeli daily Haaretz quoted Netanyahu as saying. "But there has to be a change in the PA leadership's behaviour."

Netanyahu and Abbas shook hands at the summit in Paris, but no substantial talks were reported and both sides played down the importance of the brief encounter. US Secretary of State John Kerry last week held separate talks with Netanyahu and Abbas, but left without achieving a breakthrough. After returning to the United States, Kerry said the conflict was at a "pivotal point" and expressed concern over "the potential for the situation to spin out of control."

Yesterday's violence also came a day after a Jerusalem court found two Israelis guilty of the burning alive of a Palestinian teen in the runup to last year's Gaza war, but held off on convicting the alleged ringleader. The third defendant, a 31-year-old Israeli settler, was found to have committed the crime, but the court delayed convicting him after his lawyers submitted a report in recent days arguing his mental state meant he was not responsible for his actions. The report will now have to be evaluated, with a new hearing set for Dec 20.

Palestinians and the victim's family harshly criticized the delay. Mohammed Abu Khdeir, 16, was abducted and killed in July 2014, weeks after the kidnap and murder of three Israeli teenagers in the West Bank. Separately yesterday, a Jewish extremist convicted of arson over the 2014 burning of an Arabic-Hebrew bilingual school seen as a rare symbol of coexistence in Jerusalem was sentenced to three years in prison. — AFP

PIPE BOMB EXPLODES NEAR ISTANBUL METRO

ISTANBUL: Five people were injured when a pipe bomb exploded on an overpass near an Istanbul metro station yesterday, the district mayor said, halting some train operations and heightening security fears in Europe's biggest city. Turkey has been on high alert since more than 100 people were killed by two suicide bombers in the capital Ankara in October, three months after a similar attack at a town near the Syrian border in July left 33 dead.

Yesterday's blast near the Bayrampasa metro station came at the height of the evening rush hour, district Mayor Atilla Aydiner told A Haber television. Bayrampasa is a residential and industrial area on the European side of Istanbul. Another broadcaster earlier reported that one person had been killed but Aydiner confirmed only five injuries.

Grainy CCTV footage showed a large flash of light on the overpass followed by what appeared to be burning embers showering to the ground as cars drove below. Photographs on social media showed what appeared to be dozens of people walking alongside overground train tracks after trains had been halted. Although Istanbul's metro is largely underground, it runs above ground in some places, including around Bayrampasa. Yesterday's blast was much smaller than the

ones in Ankara and the town of Suruc near the Syrian border, which are believed to have been carried out by Islamic State militants. Turkey, a NATO member, has carried out air strikes against the Islamist insurgents in neighboring Syria as part of the US-led coalition fighting the jihadist movement. It also faces security threats from the outlawed Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK), whose militants often attack police and security in Turkey's mainly Kurdish southeast, and the far-left Revolutionary People's Liberation Army-Front (DHKP-C). The DHKP-C, which is considered a terrorist organization by the United States and Ankara, said that one of its members was involved in an attack on the US consulate in August. — Reuters

VENEZUELA'S HARRIED OPPOSITION EYES LANDMARK WIN

CARACAS: Its leaders have been thrown in jail, banned from politics and remain deeply divided, but Venezuela's opposition nonetheless looks set to bruise President Nicolas Maduro by winning control of the National Assembly. Sixteen years into late president Hugo Chavez's leftist "revolution", opinion polls indicate the opposition is poised to win legislative elections Sunday for the first time since the firebrand leader came to power.

That is a sign of widespread frustration with the economic mess besieging oildependent Venezuela, where spiralling inflation, empty supermarket shelves and long lines have become the norm under Maduro, Chavez's embattled successor. But it is also a sign that the government's crackdown on the opposition has backfired, said political analysts.

Seven opposition politicians have been banned from politics over allegations of corruption or conspiring to overthrow the government, including popular former lawmaker and presidential candidate Maria Corina Machado. Another 75 are being held as "political prisoners," the opposition says, including protest leader Leopoldo Lopez,

who was sentenced to nearly 14 years in September in a case that drew condemnation from human rights groups and the United Nations. "The government has been badly damaged by its own aggressive strategy," said political scientist Elsa Cardozo of Simon Bolivar University.

The opposition coalition, the Democratic Unity Roundtable (MUD), heads into the elections leading the ruling United Socialist Party of Venezuela (PSUV) and its allies by as much as 35 percentage points, according to one poll. Founded in 2009 with the goal of defeating Chavez, MUD is a motley group of some 30 parties from across the political spectrum, with no real leader. The coalition, which has always struggled with its own internal divisions, has gotten a counterintuitive boost from the authorities' harsh treatment, especially Lopez's jailing, said Luis Vicente Leon, head of polling firm Datanalisis. "The government made a mistake (in the Lopez case). It made him into a martyr, which motivates people to vote," Leon told AFP.

Strength in Adversity

Lopez, a 44-year-old economist with a

master's degree from Harvard, was the most visible leader of massive protests that shook Venezuela last year and left 43 people dead. At the time of his arrest on charges of inciting violence, his radical strategy of forcing Maduro from power through protests was rejected by some in MUD, including the coalition's candidate in the past two presidential elections, Henrique Capriles. But by jailing Lopez, the government rallied support around him, said Leon, who called Venezuela "a 'Chavista' country (that) is disgruntled with Maduro."

Many Venezuelan voters still harbor lingering loyalty to Chavez, who ruled from 1999 until his death of cancer in 2013 and used the oil giant's crude revenues to fund a populist economic model he called "21st-century socialism". But as Maduro has struggled to address dwindling oil revenues and other economic woes, his own popularity has plunged to around 22 percent. Given the widespread frustration, the opposition has not needed to run a high-octane campaign, and the lack of well-known names among its candidates does not appear to be hurting it. The PSUV has even attacked it for being too

invisible. "They haven't campaigned. Their candidates are in hiding. No one knows them," said PSUV campaign chief Jorge Rodriguez.

New Troubles Ahead

The authorities' treatment of the opposition has however propelled it into the spotlight, including on the international stage. With Lopez locked up in solitary confinement at a military prison outside Caracas, his wife, Lilian Tintori, has met US Secretary of State John Kerry, Pope Francis and Spanish Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy. "All this has boosted the opposition's international visibility," said Leon. But beyond a shared call for "change," not much unites the opposition, said Latin America expert Jean-Jacques Kourliandsky of French international relations institute IRIS.

"Aside from that, there's little in common between its members, who cover the political terrain from one extreme to the other," he said, adding that MUD's unity will be difficult to sustain if it wins the elections and has to share power with a hostile president. Victory, he said, "will also mean an even more difficult situation to manage." — AFP

POWERFUL LEGISLATOR SILVER CONVICTED IN BRIBERY CASE

CONVICTION SENDS NY POLITICS INTO TURMOIL

ALBANY, New York: The conviction of former Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver has shaken New York politics down to the granite foundations of the state Capitol, provoking fresh calls to overhaul a system that has stubbornly clung to its long history of corruption. A jury convicted the 71-year-old Manhattan Democrat on Monday on charges that he traded favors for \$4 million in kickbacks from a cancer researcher and real estate developers.

The rapid downfall was as shocking to lawmakers as it was troubling to longtime observers of New York politics. "A political earthquake has hit Albany," said Blair Horner, legislative director for the New York Public Interest Group. "This is a stinging rebuke to the 'Albany business as usual' defense and a clarion call to clean up state ethics." Silver, first elected in 1976, plans to appeal. He was ousted as speaker following his January arrest and lost his legislative seat upon conviction. He remains free on bail but faces decades in prison when he is sentenced.

For two decades, Silver loomed large as one of Albany's "three men in a room," who along with the Senate leader and the governor negotiated budgets, cut deals and defined New York's brash brand of backroom politics. Gov. Andrew Cuomo and Silver's successor as speaker, Bronx Democrat Carl Heastie, said the conviction shows the need for stronger ethics rules. "Words simply aren't enough," Heastie said following the verdict. "We will continue to work to root out cor-

ruption and demand more of elected officials when it comes to ethical conduct." Cuomo said the verdict showed "it is time for the Legislature to take seriously the need for reform. There will be zero tolerance for the violation of the public trust in New York."

Reform List

The list of possible reforms already was a long one before Silver was arrested: Term limits, restrictions on lawmakers' outside income, new campaign finance rules and tougher ethics enforcement all have been suggested, only to languish on the legislative agenda. Meanwhile, 30 lawmakers have left office since 2000 because of criminal charges or allegations of ethical misconduct. The Senate's former No. 2 member, Republican Thomas Libous, was sentenced to house arrest last week for lying to the FBI. Ex-Senate Leader Dean Skelos currently is on trial for charges that he extorted bribes and jobs for his son.

In just the past five years, one Albany lawmaker was convicted of taking bribes from a carnival promoter. A second entered into a sham marriage in order to become a citizen. A third was accused of harassing female staffers and forcing one to touch cancerous tumors on his neck and armpit. "The bell could not be ringing louder for real reform in Albany than it is right now," said Assemblyman Todd Kaminsky, a former corruption prosecutor now in his first term.

otion prosecutor now in his first term.

After Silver's arrest, the Legislature passed modest

changes, including a requirement that lawmakers disclose more about their private income. Calls for greater changes, and a special session devoted to ethics, went nowhere. "What New Yorkers need most is wholesale reform of the political system," said Lawrence Norden, of the Brennan Center for Justice at New York University's School of Law. "Enough is enough - it shouldn't take even more convictions for Albany to take

reform seriously."

The prosecution was a marquee case in Manhattan US Attorney Preet Bharara's quest to clean up what he has called Albany's "cauldron of corruption". "Sheldon Silver got justice, and at long last, so did the people of New York," Bharara said. Prosecutors said Silver traded his office for \$4 million in kickbacks from a cancer researcher and real estate developers and earned an

additional \$1 million through investments.

Silver did not testify during his trial and called no witnesses. Dr Robert Taub told jurors he steered numerous patients with asbestos-related cancer to Silver's law firm, enabling the legislator to pocket \$3 million in referral fees. Meanwhile, testimony and evidence revealed, Silver caused \$500,000 in taxpayer funds to go to Taub's research projects and helped his son and daughter get a job and an internship. Prosecutors said Silver delivered tax-abatement and rent-control legislation that favored developers while big developers hired a small law firm that secretly sent him \$700.000 in fees. — AP

CUBA IMPOSES TRAVEL PERMIT FOR DOCTORS

HAVANA: The Cuban government announced yesterday that it is re-imposing a hated travel permit requirement on many doctors, requiring them to get permission to leave the country in an attempt to counter a brain drain that it blames on the United States. It is the first major reverse in Cuba's policy of allowing unrestricted travel for its citizens, put in place in 2013 as President Raul Castro allowed new freedoms as part of a broad set of social and economic reforms.

The government announced on the front page of state media that health professionals in specialties that have been drained by large-scale emigration in recent years will now be required to get permission from Health Ministry officials in order to leave the country. The new policy was announced hours after the end of a meeting Monday between US and Cuban negotiators in Washington to address a crisis in Cuban migration, which has reached its highest levels in at least two decades. Cuba complained that the US said it had no plans to change Cold War-era policies that give automatic legal residency to Cuban immigrants.

Many Cuban doctors cite low pay, poor working conditions and the possibility of well-compensated jobs in other countries as their primary reasons for emigrating. The Cuban government places the blame on the US policy of granting automatic legal residency to Cuban immigrants, with special fast-track benefits for doctors who abandon government medical missions overseas.

The government announcement cited anaesthesiology, neurosurgery, obstetrics and gynecology and neonatal care as among the specialities worst-hit by emigration of doctors in recent years.

"The migration of Cuban health professionals is a concern for the country," the government announcement read, blaming US laws that aid Cuban medical emigration for having "the perverse objective of pushing Cuban health professionals to abandon their missions in other countries". The Cuban government cites free, universal healthcare system as one of the crowning achievements of its socialist revolution. Medical missions abroad are one of the most important sources of foreign exchange for the Cuban government, which receives tens of thousands of dollars a year in cash or commodities for each doctor it sends overseas.

Inside Cuba, many doctors and nurses complain that their profession has been devastated by waves of departures, with vital specialists now absent in many clinics and hospitals. Over the past two years, at least 100,000 Cubans have emigrated to the United States, the majority making a treacherous land journey from Ecuador through South and Central America and Mexico. The pace has quickened dramatically this year, with many Cubans fearing that the detente announced nearly a year ago between the United States and Cuba will mean the end to special migration privileges. — AP

FBI ARRESTS STUDENT OVER REVENGE THREAT

CHICAGO: FBI agents on Monday arrested a black student who allegedly threatened to shoot 16 whites - one for each bullet that hit a teen in a notorious police shooting. Police officer Jason Van Dyke, who was charged last week with the murder of 17-year-old Laquan McDonald was released on a \$1.5 million bail, local media reported. Van Dyke's release came just hours after the online mass shooting threat by Jabari Dean, 21, caused the University of Chicago

to close its doors.

In the latest racially charged incident to trouble the US city in recent weeks, Dean allegedly admitted to posting the threat when federal agents arrived at his Chicago home. He told investigators that he had deleted the macabre message shortly after posting it, charging papers said. But a fellow user of the unidentified social media forum where the message was posted had already taken a screen shot of the threat and showed it to the FBI on Sunday.

The posting described a plan to bring an assault rifle and two handguns to the campus quad on Monday and to "execute" 16 white male students or staff members. This was allegedly to be carried out to

avenge McDonald, a 17-year-old black Chicago youth who was cut down in a hail of 16 police bullets in Oct 2014. "I will then die killing any number of white policemen that I can in the process. This is not a joke," the message read. "I am to do my part to rid the world of the white devils. I expect you to do the same."

Tensions flared last week after officials released a dashcam video showing police officer Van Dyke shoot McDonald after the teenager walked away from him. The graphic video was the latest in a string of police shootings caught on camera that have sparked mass - and sometimes violent -protests. The footage has fueled an already acrimonious national debate about racism and the use of deadly force by

And the latest threat reflects a grim reality of American life, with campus shootings happening on a semi-regular basis. On Oct 1, a gunman opened fire at a community college in Oregon, killing nine before taking his own life. Deadly shootings were also recorded on a campus in Tennessee on Oct 22, and on a North Carolina campus on Nov 1. One person died in each attack. — AFP

COLORADO CLINIC SHOOTER CHARGED WITH MURDER

COLORADO SPRINGS: The man accused of killing three people and wounding nine in a shooting rampage at a Planned Parenthood clinic in Colorado Springs was told he faces first-degree murder charges during his first court appearance on Monday. Robert Lewis Dear, 57, appearing by video link from jail, spoke only to tell a judge he understood and had no questions. There was no discussion of the motive for the Friday shooting during the brief hearing, and formal charges will be filed next week.

Police records from North Charleston, South Carolina, showed that Dear was charged with rape there in 1992, although Reuters could not determine in court records how the case was resolved. Planned Parenthood has said reports that Dear told investigators "no more baby parts" after his arrest showed he was acting on an antiabortion agenda. Chief Judge Gil Martinez told Dear, who was in handcuffs and leg irons and strapped into a padded vest, apparently for his own safety, that if convicted, he faces a minimum sentence of life without parole or a maximum of death.

District Attorney Dan May said prosecutors had 63 days after Dear's arraignment to decide whether to bring a death penalty case.

Documents in the investigation were ordered sealed by the court on Monday. For his appearance by closed-circuit camera from the jail where he is being held without bond, Dear was flanked by Dan King of the state's public defender's office. A handful of victims sat in the front of the packed courtroom, watching Dear on a screen.

The rampage blamed on the South Carolina native is believed to have been the first deadly attack on a US abortion provider in six years. The Colorado Springs center has been the target of protests by anti-abortion activists. A police officer and two civilians died in the attack, which according to emerging details, began just outside the building, adjacent to a shopping area on the northwest side of Colorado's second-largest city.

Ke'Arre Stewart, 29, an Iraq war veteran, was shot in front of the clinic after walking out to talk on his cell phone. Wounded, he ran back inside to warn others to take cover, his brother told NBC News. Stewart died of his wound. "I believe that's his military instinct, you know," NBC News quoted his brother, Leyonte Chandler, as saying. "Before his time ran out, I guess that was his main priority ... to help and save other lives."

Reviewing Security

US Justice Department officials have joined the investigation, raising the possibility the federal government could bring a terrorism or civil rights case against Dear. Planned Parenthood was already on heightened alert against threats of violence nationwide. Some affiliates said they would review their security measures further. Several US media outlets, citing unnamed law enforcement sources, have said Dear used the phrase "no more baby parts" in statements he made to investigators after his surrender. Reuters could not independently confirm those

The reported comment was widely seen as an apparent reference to secretly recorded videos released months ago that anti-abortion groups have said showed Planned Parenthood officials discussing the sale of aborted fetal tissue. Planned Parenthood has said the videos were produced to distort the issue of fetal-tissue donations made by the group for scientific research. Authorities have said they do not know what precipitated the attack and have declined to discuss publicly the suspect's motives. — Reuters

NEW BURKINA PRESIDENT VOWS 'BETTER TOMORROW'

OUAGADOUGOU: Burkina Faso's president in waiting Roch Marc Kabore vowed a brighter future for the west African country yesterday after becoming its first newly-elected leader in three decades.

Kabore won 53.49 percent of ballots in Sunday's poll, winning victory in the first round of a vote to restore stability after a popular revolt toppled longtime leader Blaise Compaore just over a year go. "We must get to work immediately," 58-year-old Kabore, a former Compaore stalwart who served as his prime minister but broke ranks months before his downfall, told several thousand supporters in the early hours of yesterday.

"Together we must serve the country," he said, pledging "to open up opportunities for a better tomorrow". Turnout was over 60 percent, making Kabore's victory the largest in three decades, far outstripping Compaore's re-election results during his long stay in office. His nearest rival Zephirin Diabre scored 29.65 percent. Kabore expressed his "warm congratulations" to the transitional government that has run the west African country since Compaore was deposed by an uprising after trying to change the constitution to extend his 27-year rule.

Kabore, an affable strongly-built ex banker and politician, was long an ally of Compaore and even headed the ruling party.

'He deserved to win'

But in his brief time in the opposition he became a driving force in the campaign to oppose Compaore's bid for a third term. "We have a new president, we hope he succeeds in his mission in the interests of the people who rose up and in the interests of all of Burkina Faso's people," said Harouna Kabore, spokesman for a score of civil society groups behind the October 2014 insurrection.

Even Diabre supporters spoke out in support of the new leader, with waiter Medard Nedie saying "the election was perfect, there were no problems, so he deserved to win. "Now we're waiting for the work." In September this year, activists returned to the capital's streets to protest a short-lived putsch by Compaore loyalists in the presidential guard.

That unrest forced the presidential and parliamentary elections to be delayed, but Sunday's vote went off largely without incident, with voters hungry for change standing in long lines to cast their ballot. The head of the electoral commission, Barthelemy Kere, described the vote as "generally satisfactory" despite "a few anomalies" and said turnout was strong in all of the country's 45 provinces.

'Real change'

Political scientist Salam Kassem dubbed the election "one of the cleanest

ever organized in Africa." "People opted for Roch because they didn't want a brutal break, they wanted a soft exit from the previous regime." Burkina Faso's 18 million people, most of whom live in grinding poverty, are hoping for a long era of peace and democracy.

Seen as a consensus figure by some and an opportunist by others, Kabore has pledged to build "a new Burkina Faso" by fighting youth unemployment, improving education and modernizing the health system. For over a decade he led the ruling Congress for Democracy and Progress (CDP) party and was seen as Compaore's likely heir, but fell out with the strongman in 2012 and last year formed his own opposition party. Michel Kafando, leader of the transitional regime, praised the vote as "the first fully democratic, transparent" election since 1978.

'Sighing with relief'

"We're smiling broadly, we're sighing with relief," said Halidou Ouedraogo, chairman of CODEL, the civil society platform monitoring the election. "The Burkinabe people rose to the challenge of holding these historic elections in a calmer atmosphere." UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon hailed the election's "peaceful atmosphere" as well as the "strong participation of women in the electoral process," his spokesman Stephane Dujarric said.

The CDP was barred from fielding a candidate in the presidential poll under a contested law that prevented anybody connected with Compaore's attempts to cling to power from seeking office.

But the well-entrenched party had several representatives standing in the parliamentary election and could score well under the system of proportional representation. Around 25,000 members of the

security force were deployed to keep the peace during the election, reflecting the nervousness in Burkina Faso over the uptick in Islamist attacks in neighbouring Mali. In recent weeks there have been signs of the violence spilling over the border, with suspected jihadists attacking two police barracks along the frontier in recent weeks and holding up a van carrying money from a gold mine in the north. —AFP

LABOR LEADER SAYS CAMERON PLAN LACKS 'ENDGAME'

OVER 410 BIRTHS IN CAMPS FOR BOKO HARAM DISPLACED

ABUJA: More than 410 babies were born in the space of two months in camps for people displaced by the Boko Haram insurgency in northeast Nigeria, the country's main relief agency said yesterday. "Over 410 births were recorded between August and September" in the camps in Borno and Adamawa state, said the head of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), Muhammad Sani Sidi.

In the same period, there were 187 marriages — 100 in camps in the Borno state capital, Maiduguri, and 87 in neighboring Adamawa, he added in a statement. Boko Haram's fight to create a hardline Islamic state in northeast Nigeria, which began in 2009, has killed at least 17,000 people and made more than 2.6 million others homeless.

Some 10 percent of the 2.0 million or so Nigerians internally displaced by the conflict now live in government-run camps, according to the International Organization for Migration. In recent months, the camps have also accommodated hundreds of women and children kidnapped by the insurgents and rescued by the military during its counter-offensive.

A statement from Borno state governor Kashim Shettima in May said the rebels "deliberately rape women with the intention of getting them pregnant so they would give birth to future insurgents". The same month, a retired midwife helping at the Malkohi camp outside the Adamawa state capital, Yola, told AFP 10 to 15 women were in the early to midstages of pregnancy. Pregnancy tests were also given as part of medical screening for women among the 275 people rescued from Boko Haram's Sambisa Forest stronghold earlier that month.

NEMA's Sidi, however, made no reference as to whether the births in September and October were from women kidnapped by Boko Haram and forced into marriage with Islamist fighters. The agency's spokesman, Manzo Ezekiel, also declined to comment, saying how the women became pregnant was not their focus. "We just help them deliver," he told AFP by telephone from Maiduguri. "The period of time these people were displaced is not more than one year. You can still assume the husbands were responsible for the pregnancy," he added. No other figures were available on births in the camps, he said. — AFP

LONDON: British Prime Minister David Cameron said yesterday his government had unanimously agreed a

Britain can no longer "sub-contract" its security to other countries after the group said it was behind last month's Paris attacks. But his push to win approval for the action in the House of Commons on Wednesday, avoiding a repeat of a damaging defeat in 2013 on a motion to strike Syria, has deepened divisions in the Labor Party.

New Labor leader Jeremy Corbyn accused

New Labor leader Jeremy Corbyn accused Cameron of rushing to war, and appealed to those Labor lawmakers who favor the motion to "think again ... and please cast your vote against supporting this government's military endeavors in Syria".

Cameron said his cabinet had agreed the motion on extending air strikes to Syria from Iraq, where British warplanes have been bombing targets since Sept. 30 last year. "That motion talked about, yes, the necessity of taking military action against ISIL (Islamic State) in Syria as well as in Iraq but it is part of a broader strategy," he said in a televised statement, adding that the debate in parliament would be thorough and would last 10-1/2 hours. Asked about the prospects for securing a majority, he said: "Let's wait and see."

Cameron is all but assured of winning parliamentary approval after Corbyn said he would allow his lawmakers to vote according to their conscience on Wednesday-breaking with a tradition for leaders to instruct lawmakers how to vote on big decisions. Media reports say about 50 Labor members of parliament (MPs) will vote with the government, although their leader, a veteran anti-war campaigner, hoped he could still persuade them to change their minds.

Corbyn argued that Cameron's case did not meet his party's demands. "I am saying to every MP, you've got to make up your own mind ... on whether we should commit British troops into yet another war in the Middle East with no endgame in sight," he told BBC Radio Two.

Many Britons are wary of entering into more costly military action in the Middle East after Western intervention in Iraq, Libya and Afghanistan failed to bring stability and, some believe, led to the rise of militants

such as Islamic State.

British finance minister George Osborne said the cost of extending air strikes into Syria would run into the "low tens of millions of pounds". But after Islamic State claimed responsibility for killing 130 people in Paris, some members of parliament who were reluctant to launch the air strikes now feel they are needed to protect Britain from such attacks. Defence Secretary Michael Fallon told lawmakers yesterday there was an "urgent need" for Britain to launch air strikes against Islamic State in Syria for "our own security". — Reuters

GERMAN CABINET APPROVES MILITARY AID FOR IS FIGHT

BERLIN: The German cabinet yesterday approved a mandate for military assistance to back the international fight against the Islamic State jihadist group in Syria following the Paris attacks.

The package, which still requires parliamentary approval, covers Tornado reconnaissance jets, a naval frigate and up to 1,200 troops in response to a French appeal. The engagement steps up German involvement in the campaign against IS for the first time to a more direct role.

Chancellor Angela Merkel noted that the German engagement began in September 2014 with the start of a program to train and arm peshmerga forces from Iraq's autonomous Kurdish region fighting IS. "We are expanding this participation in the existing alliance with a fight against the same IS but now in Syria," Merkel, who pledged Paris "any and all assistance" after the jihadist attacks that killed 130 people, told reporters.

The mandate is for one year at a cost of 134 million euros (\$142 million) and can be extended in 2016.

By providing for up to 1,200 soldiers for aerial reconnaissance and support, it would be the largest Bundeswehr mission at the moment, following a drawdown in Afghanistan. Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier acknowledged ahead of the cabinet vote that it could be a protracted

"We are doing what is militarily necessary, what we can do best, and what we

can back politically," Steinmeier told the daily Bild. "We need patience against an enemy like IS." The head of the armed forces union, the Bundeswehrverband, Andre Wuestner, told public broadcaster ARD that he expected the fight to last "far more than 10 years" and called for a "clearly defined mission".

The parliamentary vote is set for Friday, with approval considered virtually guaranteed as Merkel's "grand coalition" government has an overwhelming majority. Germany is to deploy by early January from the Incirlik air base in Turkey six Tornado aircraft fitted with surveillance technology that can take high-resolution photos and infrared images, even at night and in bad weather.

A German frigate will help protect the French aircraft carrier Charles de Gaulle in the eastern Mediterranean, from which fighter jets are carrying out bombing runs, and the tanker aircraft could refuel them mid-air to extend their range. FIERCE CAMPAIGN TO STOP FAR-RIGHT WIN IN FRANCE

PARIS: France's far-right National Front (FN) faced a ferocious campaign yesterday to stop it taking two of France's most important regions in elections starting this weekend. As Prime Minister Manuel Valls called the party a "menace to the economy" and business leaders warned of the "ruin" it could cause, two of the main newspapers in the north launched an unprecedented campaign to stop its leader Marine Le Pen taking control of the region.

La Voix du Nord daily and its sister paper Nord Eclair ran a second day of attacks on Le Pen and the party Tuesday, questioning their competence to rule the Nord-Pas-de-Calais-Picardie region.

Articles headlined "Marine Le Pen and the Front are not who they say they are" and "Who are the members of the FN really?" cast doubt on the party's ability to govern the depressed region, once a Socialist stronghold. Le Pen, who looks set to win the region-France's second biggest-in the two-round vote which ends on December 13, reacted with fury to the "scandalous"

She branded the four pages dedicated to the party she inherited from her father,

Jean-Marie Le Pen, little more than "tracts" in support of the ruling Socialist party.

"We shouldn't be surprised," she shot back, "it's payback for the nine million euros (\$9.5 million) of subsidies they (the newspapers) have got from the Socialists during their mandate." French regional newspapers, which outsell their national counterparts, rarely take a strong editorial line in the run-up to elections. But La Voix du Nord-which refuted the claims that it was in the pay of the FN's rivals as "counter to the truth and the facts"-accused the Le Pen family of "nepotism".

'Economic danger'

With Marine Le Pen's 25-year-old niece Marion Marechal-Le Pen also ahead in the race for the vast southeastern region that includes the French Riviera, Premier Valls claimed the party could be "pushed back if everyone does their duty" and goes out to vote. Latest polls also show the anti-Muslim and anti-immigrant party, which has never before won a region, in a close battle for two others, Normandy in the northwest and Burgundy and Franche-Comte in the east.—AFP

RISE OF ANTI-TALEBAN MILITIAS STOKES INSTABILITY FEARS

JAMSHEDI, Afghanistan: Riding on horse- Jamshedi for Taleban intruders blamed for a back and motorbikes, commander Naeem's fighters combed a fog-enveloped Taleban infiltration route in Afghanistan's northern badlands, as the government expands anti-insurgent militias across a patchwork of fiefdoms.

Desperate to muzzle the resurgent Taleban, the government is cultivating thousands of militias with chequered pasts as a short-term security fix to supplement ground troops suffering record casualties. But the rise of these groups, a throwback to the devastating civil war in the 1990s that set the stage for a Taliban takeover, risk aggravating factionalism and pushing Afghanistan deeper into what observers call a self-perpetuating conflict. For Naeem, a militia commander with a short, thickset frame who leads around 200 fighters in the volatile Pashtun Kot district in Faryab province bordering Turkmenistan, they are key for survival.

In a scene that could have been lifted from history books, his horse-mounted warriors with back-slung guns and RPG warheads scoured a mountain pass near the village of

spate of fatal ambushes. "Without uprising forces," said Naeem, who is strongly averse to the label militias because of their contentious history, "the Taliban will overrun the district within minutes, killing their way into villages."

"Without us, Faryab will become another Kunduz," he said, referring to the northern city that the Taleban briefly captured in September in their most spectacular victory in 14 years. There are around 5,000 men serving in Faryab's irregular or semi-regular armed groups-and Afghan politicians are pushing for thousands more across the region as the stubborn insurgency expands, a Western official told AFP.

"The price of an AK47 has roughly doubled in the capital Maimana's bazaar over the last two years as militias have re-mobilised in Faryab," the official said, requesting anonymity.

President Ashraf Ghani's government also plans to scale up the Afghan Local Police (ALP) US-backed village defense forces likened to militias-to 45,000 from a nationwide force of around 30,000, he said.

The proliferation of militias, a potential

powder keg in the already strife-torn nation, represents a complete departure from previous government efforts to disarm these groups and is at odds with Ghani's recent pledges to rein them in.

"The rapid growth of armed groups is alarming as these groups have a terrible history of abusing human rights and refusing to obey their purported masters in the government" the official said.

Protectors or predators?

With inadequate training, a lack of government oversight and a pervasive culture of corruption and impunity, some militias have morphed into brutal criminal gangs. One ALP unit in Faryab was accused of using a dry well filled with snakes as a torture chamber, according to a recent International Crisis Group report.

Another used a captive in an open field for target practice. Their terrifying tactics including theft, rape and drug trafficking have turned some villages into ghost towns while driving residents in other areas to join the insurgency for self-protection. — AFP

2 PAKISTANI SOLDIERS KILLED IN TARGETED KARACHI ATTACK

Pakistan denies war crimes in Bangladesh

KARACHI: Gunmen killed two Pakistani soldiers in the southern city of Karachi yesterday, the military said, a rare attack on the powerful army that could indicate the beginning of a push-back against a tightening crackdown on violence. The two were shot on a busy road in the center of Karachi, Pakistan's largest city and financial hub. The killings follow an attack that killed four soldiers last month.

No soldier had been killed in Karachi before that since March, underlining their protected status in a city where murders of policemen, politicians and

prominent businessmen are common. "The two were sitting in their official vehicle, when two men shot them from behind and fled," senior police officer Jamil Ahmed told media. Pakistan's military said unidentified gunmen riding a motorcycle

fired on the soldiers. Karachi, a metropolis of about 20 million people, is home to the stock exchange and central bank and is plagued by political, ethnic and sectarian violence.

Security officials say many politicians in the city have links to violent gangs, operating like a mafia to maintain their hold on power. Two years ago, the military launched a crackdown targeting suspected militants and violent criminals.

Murders have sharply declined since the crack-

down began, although violence is still common. In recent months, the crackdown has expanded to include alleged corruption. Opposition politicians say the military is using it as an excuse to target them. The military denies the accusations.

War crimes

Meanwhile, Pakistan has denied committing war crimes during Bangladesh's independence conflict in 1971, in what analysts said yesterday was an unusually strong statement signalling worsening ties.

The move follows the executions in Bangladesh last week of senior opposition leaders convicted of war crimes during the conflict. Pakistan has engaged in a war of words with its former eastern wing, which broke away in 1971 following the rise of a separatist movement and genocide as well as rape by Pakistani forces of Bangladeshi civilians.

In a statement by the foreign office on Monday, Islamabad "rejected insinuation of 'complicity in committing crimes or war atrocities."

"Nothing could be further from the truth," the statement added. Badar Alam, editor of Pakistan's Herald magazine, said the statement was a "stiffening of Islamabad's stance" that marked a retreat from former Pakistani military ruler Pervez Musharraf's 2002 statement of regret for "excesses committed during the unfortunate period".

Bangladesh has been roiled by violence for much of the last three years since a domestic tribunal began delivering its verdicts on opposition figures accused of orchestrating massacres during the 1971 war. Four people have so far been sent to the gallows in trials criticized by some groups for failing to reach international standards.

"Both countries have to cater to their internal gallery. If you look at the war crimes trials that are happening in Bangladesh, most observers are seeing them in the context of current domestic politics in that country," Alam added. "Pakistan is also playing to its own gallery. At this time Pakistan appears to be in conflict with every country in South Asia," he said yesterday, noting worsening ties with Afghanistan and India. Dhaka says the 1971 war left three million people dead, though independent researchers put the

Pakistan formally recognized Bangladesh's independence in 1974, but has never issued an official apology for its actions during the war.

A 1972 Pakistani judicial inquiry said genocide had been committed, but its recommendations to try the generals responsible were never followed. — AFP

PAKISTAN, AFGHAN LEADERS VOW to resume Taleban peace talks

ISLAMABAD: The leaders of Afghanistan and Pakistan agreed to work together to revive stalled peace talks with Taleban insurgents after meeting on the sidelines of a climate change conference in Paris, officials said.

Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif and Afghan President Ashraf Ghani met Monday amid heightened tensions over Kabul's accusations that Islamabad aided the Taliban in their brief capture of the northern Afghan city of Kunduz in late September.

Pakistan, which wields considerable influence over the militants, hosted a historic first round of peace negotiations in July. But the talks stalled soon thereafter when the Taliban belatedly confirmed the death of their longtime leader Mullah

The United States and China have been pushing for the process to restart, but frosty ties between Islamabad and Kabul have been hampering those efforts.

A Pakistan government statement late Monday said Ghani and Sharif had discussed the negotiations while they were in Paris. "Both leaders agreed to work with all those who would enter such a process as legitimate political actors and act, alongside the Afghan government, against those who refuse to take the path of peace," the statement said.

Hopes for better ties were high after Ghani's election last year. But they have since plummeted, with Kabul blaming Islamabad for a surge in Taliban violence in

The Pakistani statement said Monday's talks were held "in an atmosphere of warmth and cordiality".

Sharif also met his Indian counterpart Narendra Modi at the conference, the government said in a statement issued in Paris late Monday.

"The Indian Prime Minister approached Premier Nawaz Sharif and had a brief meeting with him," the statement said, adding that the leaders seemed "friendly" and parted with a "warm handshake".

India and Pakistan have been archrivals since gaining independence from Britain in 1947 and have fought three wars. Speaking at the UN General Assembly on Wednesday, Sharif outlined a four-point initiative to ease tensions between the two nuclear-armed coun-

JAPAN PROBES MYSTERY BOATS CARRYING DEAD BODIES OFF COAST

every year, ghostly wrecked ships thought to come from impoverished North Korea. Japanese authorities said yesterday they are investigating nearly a dozen wooden boats carrying decomposing bodies that were found off the country's northwestern coast over the past month.

In most cases, the bodies are in such bad shape

TOKYO: They drift into seas near Japan by the dozens after being at sea for weeks that it's been impossible to determine their cause of death, officials say. On Nov 20, officials found 10 bodies in three boats off the coast of Ishikawa prefecture. Two days later, another wooden boat was found off nearby Fukui prefecture with six skulls, one nearly intact body with a head, and various other bones and remains, coast guard official Yuka Amao told The Associated Press.

Coast guard officials said at least 11 shoddy fishing boats carrying the bodies have arrived since late October. Most are carrying equipment, nets and signs written in Korean, including one carrying a sign saying "Korean People's Army," the North Korean army.

The officials said they could not say for certain, but the poor condition and small size of the 10- to 12meter-long (33-foot- to 40-foot-long) vessels are not typical of South Korea or Japan, said coast guard spokesman Yoshiaki Hiroto. He said evidence suggests the boats are from the Korean Peninsula, though he declined to identify the country. The recent spate of arrivals has drawn attention, though such discoveries are not out of the ordinary: dozens of such wrecked boats drift toward the Japan every year.

So far this year, 34 mystery boats have drifted over, including the 11 found between late October and November. Last year, Japan found 65 of them. In 2013, there were 80, according to the coast guard.

The number tends to rise during the fall and winter season because of prevailing winds from the northwest, Hiroto said. In recent years, fishermen from foodshort North Korea have increasingly forayed into Japanese waters hunting squid, and some of the boats found adrift have been carrying squid-catching equipment. They are usually ordered away when caught by the Japanese coast guard since the two countries lack a fishing agreement.

Sometimes disabled North Korean vessels are rescued with their crews intact, and repatriated. In other cases, fishermen have used their ships to defect to South Korea. The history of such drifting arrivals goes back centuries, according to historical accounts. — AP

BLANK SPACES REPLACE NYT ARTICLE ON THAI ECONOMY

BANGKOK: The International New York Times said its printer in Thailand removed an article on the moribund state of the kingdom's economy yesterday, forcing the edition to carry blank spaces including on the cover.

It was the second time in 10 weeks that the paper has said its local printer declined to run an article, in a country where media freedoms have been increasingly curtailed since last year's military takeover.

Yesterday's newspaper was supposed to run a report headlined "Thai economy and spirits are sagging" that explored the junta's inability to jump-start the flagging economy. It also touched briefly on succession concerns surrounding 87-year-old King Bhumibol, the world's longest serving monarch who is revered but ailing.

Instead chunks of the front page and page six were blank and carried the sentence: "The article in this space was removed by our printer in Thailand. The International New York Times and its editorial staff had no role in its removal." A spokeswoman for the paper gave the same reply when asked for comment by AFP.

Eastern Printing PCL, the paper's Thai printer, did not comment on why it pulled the piece when contacted by AFP. The article was still accessible online in Thailand.

Not the first time

On September 22 Eastern Printing failed to publish the entire newspaper because the Asia edition featured a detailed frontpage article on the health of King Bhumibol, a hugely controversial topic in Thailand. That story also discussed anxieties over the succession.

Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn, who does not enjoy his father's widespread popularity, is next in line for the throne. The monarchy is shielded by one of the world's toughest lese majeste laws and prosecutions have surged since the military coup.

The media routinely self-censors when reporting on the monarchy for fear of falling foul of the broadly-worded law, which carries up to 15 years in jail for each count of insulting the king, queen, heir or Yesterday's piece was centered on the

stuttering economy in Thailand, which has one of the lowest growth rates in Southeast Asia. The country is blighted by high household debt, low consumer confidence and disappointing exports. Since toppling a democratically elected

government in May 2014, Thailand's generals have stamped down on critical media. But some criticism does take place.

US MARINE FOUND GUILTY OF KILLING TRANSGENDER FILIPINO

Pemberton sentenced to 6-12 years in Jail

OLONGAPO, Philippines: A Philippine court yesterday convicted a US Marine of killing a Filipino last year after he discovered she was a transgender woman in a hotel while he was on a break after participating in joint military exercises in the country. Lance Cpl Joseph Scott Pemberton was convicted of homicide by first strangling Jennifer Laude and then dunking her head into a toilet bowl in the hotel they had checked into after meeting in a disco bar in October 2014 in Olongapo, a city northwest of Manila. He was sentenced to 6-12 years in jail and credited with time already spent in detention, said court clerk Gerry Gruspe.

The court also ordered Pemberton, who has been detained at a Philippine military camp for about a year, to pay Laude's family 4.6 million pesos (\$98,000) in damages. Laude's mother, Julita, said that while she was happy the verdict detailed everything that had transpired, she was not pleased with the length of the jail term because she had hoped Pemberton would be convicted of murder, a more serious crime than

"But the important thing is he will be jailed," she said, crying. "My son's life is not wasted." The Laude family's private lawyer, Harry Roque, said that "this is a bittersweet victory because it is not murder," adding that "if what he did isn't cruelty, I don't know what is." Witnesses had testified that Pemberton squeezed Laude's neck, dragged her to the toilet and dunked her head into the bowl. Two of Pemberton's US Marine colleagues testified that Pemberton told them, "I think I killed a he/she."

The judge said she downgraded the murder charge to homicide because conditions such as cruelty and treachery had not been proven. The killing sparked anger in the Philippines and reignited calls by left-wing groups and nationalists for an end to America's military presence in the country at a time when the US is reasserting its dominance in Asia and Manila has turned to Washington for support amid an escalating territorial dispute with China.

JUSTICE

Half a block from the court, dozens of left-wing protesters rejoiced after the verdict was announced by burning an effigy of Uncle Sam and yelling "Justice for Jennifer!" Police officers, fire trucks and iron railings were used to prevent them from getting closer to the courthouse.

Pemberton, an anti-tank missile operator from New Bedford, Massachusetts, was one of thousands of American and Philippine military personnel who participated in the joint exercises last year. He and a group of other Marines were on leave after the exercises and met Laude and her friends at a bar in Olongapo, a city known for its

nightlife located outside Subic Bay, a former US Navy base. At least two witnesses testified that Laude was a sex worker. Pemberton and Laude left the bar and checked in together at a nearby hotel. About 30 minutes later, Pemberton walked out, leaving the room's door ajar, according to hotel staff.

Pemberton testified in August that he had choked Laude during a fight that erupted when he discovered she was a transgender woman, but said she was still alive when he left her in a shower, according to his lawyer, Rowena Garcia Flores. Lawyers for Laude's family, however, said Laude was dead when Pemberton left her. Police have said that Laude had apparently been drowned in a toilet. In the decision, Regional Trial Court Judge Roline Ginez-Jabalde ordered Pemberton temporarily jailed at the New Bilibid Prison, a national penitentiary in suburban Muntinlupa City.

The judge said an agreement between the US and the Philippines was ambiguous and failed to state in which facility within the Philippine military headquarters Pemberton would be detained and which government agency would have supervision. She ordered that he be brought to the national penitentiary, in accordance with local laws, until it is decided where

he should be permanently held. Pemberton's lawyers made an impromptu appeal against him being brought to the national penitentiary. After meeting with the lawyers and government representatives, the judge allowed Pemberton to be detained for five days at the military headquarters pending a permanent detention site, said Roque, the Laudes' lawyer. The case has revived a debate over which government should have custody of US military personnel who run afoul of local laws under a Visiting Forces Agreement the two allies signed in 1998. The agreement, which allows US forces to conduct military exercises in the Philippines, says that the Philippines can prosecute American service members, but that the US has custody over them "from the commission of the offense until completion of all judicial proceedings." — AP

MANILA ATTACKS BEIJING SOUTH CHINA SEA CLAIMS IN COURT CASE

THE HAGUE: The Philippines has sought to debunk China's claims to disputed islands in the South China Sea, court officials said on Monday as an international tribunal wrapped up a five-day hearing.

Although Beijing has refused to take part in the hearing before the Permanent Court of Arbitration, judges have now given China until January 1 to write a rebuttal to the case laid out by Manila in the Hague. "We view China as a valued friend, and it is precisely to preserve that friendship that we initiated this arbitration," Philippine Foreign Secretary Albert Ferreros del Rosario said Monday as he closed his country's case, according to a court statement. Beijing claims sovereignty over almost the whole of the South China Sea on the basis of a segmented line that first appeared on Chinese maps in the 1940s, pitting it against several neighbors.

But it is also a party to the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea. Manila has called for the tribunal, set up in 1899, to rule on the dispute, accusing Beijing of flouting the convention.

The Philippines argued "China's claims to sovereign rights jurisdiction, and to 'historic rights', with respect to the maritime areas of the South China Sea... are contrary to the Convention," the court said in a statement issued late Monday. The Philippines also believes China has failed "in its duty to prevent its nationals from exploiting resources over which the Philippines has sovereign rights and has failed to respect traditional fishing rights at Scarborough Shoal," the statement said.

Beijing had also failed to protect the marine environment by using destructive fishing methods such as cyanide and explosives, while its ships were proving a hazard in the sea.

Even after Manila launched the court proceedings, Beijing had exacerbated the tensions by "building artificial islands at nearly all of the maritime features presently under its control," Philippine officials told the court. The hearing was held behind closed doors. But Australia, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam were allowed to have observers

Beijing has never precisely defined its claims to the strategic South China Sea, through which about a third of all the world's traded oil passes. — AFP

AUSTRALIAN FORMER HELLS ANGELS ABDUCTED IN THAILAND

BANGKOK: Thai police said yesterday they The security guards reported seeing him beatmer Hells Angels gang member at gunpoint. Wayne Rodney Schneider, 37, was kidnapped on Monday by a group of masked men outside his house in Pattaya, a seaside resort town notorious for its sprawling red light district and links with organised crime.

"He was abducted and carried into a van yesterday at dawn according to two security guards who were witnesses", Police Colonel Sukthat Pumpanmuang, commander of Pattaya City police station, told AFP. "He (Schneider) has a fitness business in Australia and was also in the Hells Angels group," he

are searching for a gang of foreigners en unconscious before being bundled into believed to have abducted an Australian for- the van. Police yesterday named their chief suspect as Antonio Bagnato, a 27-year-old Australian national.

"A court has issued an arrest warrant on charges of kidnapping and assault," Sukthat said. He added that Schneider had been in Thailand for around one month and had rented a house, putting down a 130,000 baht (\$3,626) deposit for six months. Local media reported that Schneider and Bagnato had been out drinking together the night before the kidnap. The Sydney Morning Herald added that Schneider had previously had runins with the law in his homeland, linked to his membership of the Hells Angels. The Australian embassy in Bangkok did not return calls requesting comment. — AFP

INDONESIAN POLICE FIRE TEAR GAS AT PRO-PAPUA DEMO

JAKARTA: Police fired tear gas at a hundredsstrong crowd hurling rocks yesterday during a protest in Jakarta against Indonesian rule over the eastern region of Papua, with a lawyer saying that over 100 demonstrators had been detained. Several hundred protesters, mostly university students from Papua, took part in the demonstration to mark the anniversary of the region's declaration of independence in 1961, two years before Indonesia took control.

About 400 police in riot gear were standing guard at the protest by a roundabout in downtown Jakarta, which turned violent as demonstrators hurled rocks and police responded by firing tear gas and chasing protesters. "They have no permit to stage a protest here, so we are dispersing them," said Central Jakarta police chief Hendro Pandowo, insisting the police had not used excessive force. Protest organizers insisted they had notified authorities.

Veronica Koman, lawyer from Jakarta Legal Aid Foundation, speaking on behalf of the protesters, said at least 114 had been detained by police, with some stopped before even reaching the site.Journalists at the scene saw demonstrators being put into police vehicles and driven

Police refused to confirm how many protesters had been detained. The remaining demonstrators were later driven from the scene in buses and trucks, but said they were voluntarily going to join the detained protesters at police stations to show solidarity. A low-level insurgency has simmered for decades in Papua, where local groups are fighting on behalf of the mostly Melanesian population, who are a different ethnicity from most Indonesians. Jakarta took control of the region, which forms half of the island of New Guinea, in 1963 from former colonial power the Netherlands. — AFP

RUDDER PROBLEM AND PILOT **ACTIONS LED TO AIRASIA CRASH**

JAKARTA: A rudder control system problem that had occurred nearly two dozen times in the previous 12 months coupled with the pilots' response led to last year's crash of an AirAsia plane in Indonesia that killed all 162 people on board, investigators said yesterday. In releasing their report, the country's National Transportation Safety Committee said an analysis of Flight 8501's data recorder showed the rudder control system had sent repeated warnings to the pilots during the Dec. 28 flight from the Indonesian city of Surabaya to Singapore.

Aircraft maintenance records for the Airbus A320 showed that similar problems with the rudder system had occurred 23 times during the year prior to the crash, including nine times in December. The investigators said the fault was caused by cracked soldering on an electronic card. Investigator Nurcahyo Utomo said the malfunction by itself should not have been dangerous. But after the fourth time an alarm went off during the flight, a crew member apparently went outside of handbook recommendations and removed a circuit breaker to try to reset the system, he said.

The autopilot then became disengaged, and the aircraft began to roll, but no movement was detected on the

plane's manual control stick for nine seconds, he said. It then began climbing rapidly before stalling and plummeting into the Java Sea.

Utomo said the voice recorder showed the pilot said "pull down," but in fact the plane was ascending. "It seemed that there was a miscommunication between the pilot and co-pilot after the fourth fault," he said. The same warnings had occurred three days before the crash with the same pilot, who witnessed a technician on the ground addressing the problem by removing the circuit breaker and then replacing it, according to Utomo and the investigation report. The data recorder showed the circuit breaker was apparently removed during the flight, they said.

Ruth Simatupang, a former Indonesian aviation investigator who was not involved with the report, questioned ow the rudder system problems could have continued without any proper action by AirAsia or the government.

"It should be a big question for the airline," she said, adding that if the plane had been properly maintained, the problem would have been flagged and repaired. "With the 23 faults, there should have been a strong warning about the plane issued by the Transportation Ministry." — AP

Nusra has killed four of the captives. "Praise be to God. The joy cannot be described," another of the captives told Al Jazeera. Lebanon also gave Nusra several trucks of humanitarian aid.

The Arsal incursion was a dramatic and bloody example of spillover from the 4-1/2 year old Syrian conflict. The army fought several days of lethal battles to drive the militants from the town not far from where yesterday's swap took place. The exchange began with the Nusra Front releasing the body of one of the Lebanese soldiers it had killed in captivity, Mohamed Hamieh.

The freed soldiers and policemen were carried aloft during celebrations in the town of Labweh near the Lebanese border where they briefly stopped on their way to Beirut. Politicians from across the political spectrum congratulated the men on their release. Relatives of the captives celebrated at a tented sit-in they have held near the government headquarters in Beirut since last year to press for negotiations. There was dancing and sweets were offered to visitors who went to congratulate them.

"I was born again today, this is a re-birth for me and my brother. It has been a year and five months of agony for the soldiers' parents, my parents and me," Marie Khoury, the sister of freed soldier George Khoury told Reuters at the sit-in. Qatar has been involved in efforts to mediate the release of the captives for a year or more. A previous effort to secure their release broke down a year ago after one of the captives was killed. The Qatar National News Agency said the successful mediation followed a request from the Lebanese government.

While the Nusra Front and Islamic State attacked Arsal together, the groups are enemies in the Syrian war, now in its fifth year. Qatar has been a major sponsor of the insurgency against President Bashar al-Assad, supporting rebels including groups deemed moderate by the United States. It has denied backing the Nusra Front or Islamic State. Qatar's foreign minister told Reuters in June the country did not deal with either group, but said the door should be kept open for Syrians with the Nusra Front if they decided to leave Al-Qaeda.

MPS BLAST DOW DEAL AS 'THEFT OF CENTURY'

The current Assembly asked its public funds protection committee to investigate the deal and why the government rushed the payment of the fine, when it could have delayed it. Head of the committee MP Abdullah Al-Turaiji said the deal is one of the largest financial crimes in the history of Kuwait because it cost state coffers a huge sum. He said the state-owned Kuwait Petrochemicals Co (PIC) signed the deal with the knowledge of the government and hired an international advisor, while ignoring a large number of consultants in Kuwait. He said that the financial advisor appointed by the company owned a stake in Dow Chemical and made \$62.7 million from the deal.

He charged that the then oil minister Mohammad Al-Olaim and former CEO of Kuwait Petroleum Corp Saad Al-Shuwaiyeb "cheated the Supreme Petroleum Council" with regards to the deal. He said that former oil minister Hani Hussein worked as a consultant for Dow Chemical and also for PIC. He sent 35 top oil executives into retirement to cover up the mistakes in the deal.

Turaiji said that large international banks had advised Kuwait against going ahead with the deal, but oil executives insisted to sign the joint venture. He also said that Kuwait's legal representation in the arbitration was weak and not convincing, and hinted that the whole issue might have been manipulated to make illegal profits. Turaiji then called for referring the report to the public prosecution.

But liberal MP Faisal Al-Shaye insisted that the cancellation of the joint venture came after opposition MPs threatened to grill former prime minister Sheikh Nasser was political in nature. He said the committee report is

unfair and biased because it interviewed people with one opinion, so it is one-sided. Shaye added that people who rejected the deal and SPC members who resigned were not called for the probe.

The lawmaker said that everyone knows that the decision to scrap the deal was political and wondered how the report can implicate 24 people in the issue. He said that some of the allegations are unsubstantiated, but still called for referring the report to the public prosecution for a legal probe. MP Sultan Al-Shemmari described the issue as the "theft of the century" caused by political disputes. MP Faisal Al-Kandari described the persons charged in the reports as "thieves" who betrayed national interests for their selfish interests.

The Assembly also discussed another report of the committee about public funds wasted in a private company called Advantage, which lost almost all its capital. The Assembly approved a recommendation to refer the report to the public prosecution.

In other business, the Assembly criticized Cabinet ministers for failing to answer queries by MPs and decided to hold a meeting with the government to find a solution to this problem. State Minister for National Assembly Affairs Ali Al-Omair however told the Assembly that ministers have already answered 2,007 questions from around 2,350 questions received.

Finance Minister Anas Al-Saleh told the Assembly that the government will continue to sell its stakes in local companies, adding that the process had started in 1995 and is not new. He agreed to meet with the finance committee tomorrow to discuss the issue with them. MPs also voted to ask the public utilities committee to speed up the amendment of Kuwait Airways law disputes of influential people.

"Where we find further opportunity to leverage such capability, we are prepared to expand it." US lawmakers regularly haul senior officials into Congress to testify about the progress of the US-led effort to counter IS jihadists in Iraq and Syria. The United States has been leading a coalition fighting IS in both countries since August last year and, though there are about 65 nations in the coalition, American warplanes and drones are doing the lion's share of the work. Despite more than a year of daily plane and drone strikes against the IS group, the United States is still struggling to defeat the jihadists.

Carter was joined by his top commanding officer General Joe Dunford. Asked whether the IS group had been "contained," Dunford said: "We have not contained ISIL." Speaking more than two weeks after terror attacks in Paris left 130 dead, Carter called on international powers to ramp up efforts to defeat IS. "The international community - including our allies and partners - has to step up before another attack like Paris," he said. "The more contributions we receive from other nations, the greater combat power we can achieve using our own force." His comments come as the British parliament prepares to debate whether the Royal Air Force should start bombing in Syria. — AFP

ISRAELI MILITARY GOVT, DISAGREE OVER UNREST

wo months into a wave of stabbings, shootings and vehicle attacks by Palestinians targeting Israelis, gaps are emerging between Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, the military and intelligence chiefs over what is driving the violence. The rifts raise questions about whether the right tactics are being used to quell the unrest, the most sustained that Israel, Jerusalem and the West Bank have experienced since the last Palestinian uprising, or intifada, ended in 2005.

While there is agreement between Netanyahu, the military and the Shin Bet security agency about broad aspects of the violence - that it is being carried out by "lone-wolves" active on social media and that tensions over the al-Aqsa mosque compound in Jerusalem have contributed - the deeper causes are disputed. Netanyahu has repeatedly accused 80-year-old Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas of directly inciting the unrest. He also describes it as a manifestation of Palestinians' hatred of Jews and unwillingness to accept Israel's right to exist. "What is driving this terrorism is opposition to Israel as the nation-state of the Jewish people, within any borders," he said as he left for the climate talks in Paris on Sunday.

In contrast, the military and Shin Bet have tended to point to a variety of economic and socio-political factors that they see fuelling Palestinian anger and frustration, particularly among young men and women in the Israeli-occupied West Bank. While they have criticized Abbas and his Fatah party for tacitly condoning the violence, including praising "martyrs" who have carried out stabbings, they have avoided accusing the Palestinian leader of inciting it directly. "The motivation for action is based on feelings of national, economic and personal discrimination," the Shin Bet wrote in an analysis last month. "For some of the assailants an attack provides an escape from a desperate reality they believe cannot be changed."

At a cabinet meeting in November, the head of the army's intelligence division gave a similar description, leading to a row with at least one minister who was angry that the general's briefing was not in line with the government's position. The details were leaked to Israeli media and confirmed to Reuters by a government source who attended the meeting. Since Oct 1, when the violence began, 19 Israelis and an American have been killed. Over the same period, Israeli forces have shot dead 97 Palestinians, 58 of whom were identified by Israel as assailants.


'Pinpoint Action'

As well as differences in identifying the causes, there are gaps in the approach being advocated to quell the situation. The military, which has occupied the West Bank for 48 years and is minutely involved in maintaining stability, in coordination with Palestinian security forces, is pushing for pinpoint operations that target specific perpetrators. Senior ministers who sit on Netanyahu's security cabinet want a heavier toll to be exacted on the Palestinian population, arguing that it is the only effective deterrent. So far, Netanyahu has shown no inclination to launch a large-scale military operation, despite ramping up deployments in the West Bank by 40 percent and calling up reserve units. He has also rejected suggestions by Israeli and US officials that he offer concessions to the Palestinians to diffuse tension. Violence has to end first, he says, Instead, there is a strong presence of Israeli troops and checkpoints across the West Bank, without the sort of iron-fisted tactics that marked the last intifada, although the homes of several attackers have been destroyed. "This is about taking pinpoint action to tackle specific challenges," a senior army officer told Reuters, saying operations focused on three particularly unruly areas.

Kobi Michael, a senior researcher at Tel Aviv University's Institute for National Security Studies, said the military was trying to ensure that the bulk of the population, which is not involved in violence, is as unaffected as possible. One example of the balance the military is trying to strike is in Beit Ummar, near Hebron, the most volatile West Bank city. On Friday a 19-year-old from the village, Omar Zaakiek, got into his car and drove into six Israeli soldiers, who shot him dead. Within hours Netanyahu's security cabinet announced Beit Ummar would be put under "closure", with cars barred from entering or exiting, except via a winding back road, and pedestrians having to pass through an Israeli checkpoint. Locals accused Israel of collective punishment. The mayor said Zaakiek's family was told their home faced demolition, a tactic the army and Shin Bet have called counterproductive.

Intelligence Minister Yisrael Katz acknowledged the rift between some ministers and the military and said the latter's policy of trying to isolate the attackers was flawed. "It is legitimate to have an argument about distinguishing terrorists from the Palestinian population," he told Channel 10 TV. "It is completely clear that the more you differentiate, the more your ability to deter is limited." So far Netanyahu has headed off the pressure. But the situation remains precarious. Given the complex roots of the violence, Michael said there was no military solution. "This reality cannot last long," he said. "Ultimately one side will make a mistake and the situation will spin out of control." —Reuters

DIPLOMATS SEE HADI UNDERMINING PEACE TALKS

fforts to launch peace talks to end an eight-month-old war in Yemen are being thwarted in part by Saudibacked President Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi, who fears a negotiated settlement would drive him from power, diplomats who follow Yemen said. Hadi, driven out of the capital Sanaa earlier this year by Houthi fighters that Arab neighbours say are backed by Iran, has returned to lead a government from the southern port of Aden, recaptured in July by troops from a Saudi-led Arab coalition.

Like his opponents, Hadi says he is committed to UN-led talks to end the war in one of the Arab world's poorest countries. But diplomats following the peace process say he is increasingly an obstacle, raising pressure on his Saudi sponsors to withdraw their support or help shunt him aside. "Hadi has been trying to block any kind of talks because he knows that any settlement will be the end of this political career," said one diplomat who follows Yemen, speaking on condition of anonymity. "Hadi has never been popular and it's not in his interest that the war stop before complete victory. Diplomats know that Hadi is not a serious candidate, and a settlement means he's out."

A second diplomat said there was now broad agreement that talks were the way forward because the war had reached a stalemate on the ground. But "a few dissenters" including in Hadi's camp were nonetheless holding out for a military victory. "And since that is seen as elusive, they are seen to back the conflict because a peaceful solution has nothing to offer for them."

thing to offer for them."

Hadi strongly denies he is being obstruc-

tive. "In fact, it is the opposite. The president has announced the list of participating delegates, and they are supported by an advisory team and they are ready for dialogue at any time the UN announces," said Mukhtar Al-Rahbi, an official in Hadi's office. Since an inconclusive round of talks in Geneva in June, UN special envoy to Yemen Ismail Ould Cheikh Ahmed has repeatedly sought to smooth the way to talks either in Switzerland or Oman. Britain's UN Ambassador Matthew Rycroft said on Monday talks could begin in early December.

Any end to the conflict depends on Saudi Arabia, which launched its biggest military operation for decades to back Hadi, at a time of falling oil export income and escalating regional turmoil. Riyadh says the Houthis are puppets of its regional rival Iran, and it has acted to prevent them from dominating the state, like Iran's Hezbollah allies in Lebanon. Though Saudi Arabia says it is committed to the UN peace process, it has not curbed its bombing. Diplomats say the Saudis may not let the war end as long as the Houthis remain a dominant militia.

Meanwhile, the fighting has exacerbated a humanitarian crisis in the Arabian peninsula's poorest country and derailed efforts to combat Islamist militancy. Thousands of people have died in fighting and bombing by Arab air forces. The United Nations believes all sides are guilty of war crimes. "The humanitarian suffering on the ground: we're compromising the entire future of the nation. And compromising a future generation," said the second diplomat. Yemen's powerful branch of Al-Qaeda, for years the target of a secret CIA drone war, has emerged with control of swathes of territory,

including the port city of Mukalla, capital of eastern Hadramout province.

The Saudi-led forces have informally cooperated with Al-Qaeda fighters against the common Houthi foe. Some Al-Qaeda fighters meanwhile have rallied behind a newly opened Yemeni chapter of Islamic State, an even more violent jihadi movement, which has taken on all sides, blowing up both Houthi mosques in Sanaa and targets from Hadi's government and his Arab allies in Aden.

'More Lucid'

The Houthis, mainly drawn from the Zaydi sect, a Shiite group that ruled a thousand-year kingdom in northern Yemen until 1962, say they are leading a nationalist revolution against corrupt officials, Islamist extremists and their foreign allies. They have formed a potent alliance with Hadi's predecessor Ali Abdullah Saleh, their former enemy who ruled for more than three decades until he gave way to Hadi in 2012 after "Arab Spring" protests. The war has restored Saleh's popularity with a large segment of the population, and he is seen as likely to push for a role for his former ruling party in any settlement.

The Houthis emerged as the most powerful force in the country this year after routing Hadi's government from Sanaa, and despite later losing back Aden to the Saudi-led forces, still look unlikely to be dislodged from the capital soon. While Hadi's government accuses the Houthis of obstructing talks, diplomats say they have appeared more willing than Hadi. "The Houthis are possibly more understanding and they're more lucid," said the second diplomat, who was nevertheless strongly critical of Saleh and his

"unholy alliance" with the Houthi fighters.

Not in Sync

Even before Hadi was driven out of Sanaa by the Houthis, the new president had developed a reputation as a weak leader who failed to bring rival militias to heel or curb corruption. Western and regional officials have voiced support for Hadi's prime minister and vice president, Khaled Bahah, widely seen as a rival, who some describe as a more capable technocrat. "The leadership between Bahah and Hadi is not in sync," the second diplomat said, offering praise for Bahah as a "healer" while describing Hadi as more self-interested.

Baleegh Al-Mikhlafi, a leader of the Justice party that supports Hadi, dismissed reports of a rift with Bahah as "administrative differences" that would not affect peace talks. But one of Hadi's advisors privately acknowledged differences between the two figures and said Riyadh was trying to resolve them. "Saudi Arabia is trying to bring it under control because it is ... benefiting the other side politically. But these efforts have not succeeded," said the official, who asked not to be identified.

Although the peace talks between Hadi's government and the Houthis could begin soon, diplomats are far from optimistic. The second diplomat described tactics being used to undermine negotiations "by setting the stakes of the talks knowingly so high, so that the other side finds them unacceptable." Said the first diplomat: "The talks, if they happen, will yield no results because the divide between the two groups is big and there's no clarity on which basis these talks would take place." —Reuters

KURD-HEAVY ANTI-IS STRATEGY RISKY

■he US-led coalition has made Iraqi and Syrian Kurdish forces primary allies against the Islamic State jihadist group, but over-reliance on the Kurds carries risks, analysts warn. As the world seeks to turn up the heat on IS, some of the West's main partners on the ground are the peshmerga forces from Irag's autonomous Kurdish region and the Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG) in Syria. The first soldiers officially deployed by the United States in Syria arrived last week in the north to train the YPG, a group which has close ties to Turkey's terror-listed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) rebels but which has also notched up significant military successes against IS.

In the aftermath of the deadly November 13 attacks claimed by IS in Paris, French Prime Minister Manuel Valls emphasised the need to support Kurdish forces on the ground. After IS took over swathes of Iraq in 2014, Washington launched air strikes alongside a program to train and equip local forces. The US "picked the Iraqi Kurds because they were strategic partners during the 2003 invasion and were, at least in their eyes, the most trustworthy," said Maria Fantappie, Iraq senior analyst with International Crisis Group.

More than a year on, multi-million-dollar attempts to groom Sunni Arab forces in both Iraq and Syria have yielded limited results at best and failed to sabotage IS' self-proclaimed "caliphate". Attacks in France, elections in the US and a migrant crisis across Europe converge to up public pressure for swift and decisive action against the increasingly global threat of IS.

Bargaining Chips

Kurdish forces are among the most skilled, organised and determined to battle IS in the region. But analysts warn military action should be matched with political planning for the post-IS era in Iraq and Syria, and that relying too heavily on the Kurds could backfire. The lack of a roadmap addressing Kurdish statehood aspirations is an incentive for groups to secure as many future bargaining chips as possible by winning military brownie points now.

Fantappie said that explains why the YPG might be prepared to push beyond Kurdish

areas and take part in an offensive to recapture the IS hub of Raqa, an almost entirely Arab city. "Definitely this is on their mind, especially for the YPG, which strives to gain international recognition," she said. In neighbouring Iraq, forces loyal to the regional Kurdish president Massud Barzani last month retook the town of Sinjar, the main hub of Iraq's Yazidi minority. Before IS swept across Iraq last year, it was under Baghdad's authority, not part of the autonomous Kurdish region, but Barzani is now pushing plans to maintain control of the area.

ans to maintain control of the area. Barzani "effectively announced Sinjar's annexation into the Iraqi Kurdistan region," Patrick Martin, Iraq researcher at the Institute for the Study of War, said. "There have been no indications that Kurdish fighters are prepared to hand control of the district to the Iraqi federal government," he said.

'Imbalanced Relationship'

Michael Knights, a fellow at the Washington Institute, which focuses on US policy in the Near East, said any operation to free Iraq's second city Mosul from IS would be headquartered on Kurdish real estate. "Until (IS) is removed from Mosul, the Kurds will remain a key ally. Thereafter, their future is much harder to gauge," he said. Knights said that Kurdish expansion was already close to peaking in Iraq and would be limited by a negative reaction from Baghdad, which also receives help from the coalition against IS.

The same limitation applies to Syria, where too much consolidation of Kurdish influence in the north would not sit well with NATO member Turkey. Even where the coalition is trying to foster Kurdish-Arab alliances against the jihadists, the relationship is tilted in the Kurds' favour, Fantappie said. "By picking the Kurds as strategic allies, you have created an imbalanced relationship between the Kurds and the other communities living with the Kurds," she said.

In northern Syria, the Syrian Democratic Forces alliance brings together the YPG and Arab forces, but the Kurds have direct access to funds and weapons while their partners do not, she said. "And this is dangerous because this military support can have unintended consequences..., can redraw borders within those countries and create the premises for future conflicts and tensions between the Kurds and their neighbours." —AFP

FRANCE'S PM TAKES SWIPE AT BENZEMA

PARIS: French Prime Minister Manuel Valls took a swipe at Real Madrid and France striker Karim Benzema yesterday, saying that great sportsmen should set a moral example. "A great sportsman should set an example. So many kids, so many young people... see themselves in well-known sports people,"

Valls told Europe 1 radio. "Therefore, this sportsman-and this applies to Karim Benzema or others must be exemplary. And if he is not, then he should not be in the France team." Benzema's international future is in jeopardy as he faces trial for his alleged involvement in a blackmail case linked to a sex tape featuring his France teammate Mathieu Valbuena. Valls said if a minister was facing trial, he would have to leave the government. "In one way, it's the same. When you take on responsibilities, when you are in the French team, you must set an example," the prime minister said. One of the legal conditions attached to the case is that Benzema is banned from seeing Valbuena, meaning that less than a year before France hosts the Euro 2016 championships, they cannot train together. — AFP

KENYA TO USE ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS TO STEM GRAFT

NAIROBI: Kenya's sports ministry said yesterday it will require all government payments to athletes be made via an electronic system in a bid to stop theft by sports officials. The announcement comes a day after three top athletics officials from the national federation Athletics Kenya (AK) were suspended over suspicions they had siphoned off sponsorship money from Nike and subverted anti-doping controls. In the latest hammer-blow to global track and field, the IAAF ethics commission on Monday announced the provisional suspension of the Kenyan athletics federation president and two other top officials in the "interests of the integrity of the sport". The new payment system-introduced into other Kenya government departments earlier this yearmeans salaries and payments are easily tracked. Richard Ekai, the ministry's principal secretary, its most senior civil servant, said payments in hard cash would be a thing of the past. Athletes have previously claimed they never received government allowances while performing in competitions for Kenya abroad, but with cash payments, such claims were almost impossible to verify. "Once all data has been profiled, the complaints of players not being paid their allowances on time will be a thing of the past," Ekai said. — AFP

SEAHAWKS SUFFER A BLOW AS INJURY ENDS GRAHAM SEASON

LOS ANGELES: Seattle Seahawks tight end Jimmy Graham has been ruled out for the remainder of the season after suffering a torn tendon in his knee, head coach Pete Carroll confirmed on Monday. Graham was injured during the fourth quarter of Sunday's victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers as he tried to catch a pass from Russell Wilson in the end zone. "We've loved Jimmy Graham coming to our team and we're very grateful that he's been part of it," Carroll said. "We're going to miss the heck out of him the rest of the season." Graham was placed on injured reserve on Monday as the Seahawks signed defensive tackle AJ Francis from their practice squad. Carroll did not put a timeline on Graham's recovery but was confident he would be fit for the 2016 season. "There's plenty of time for him to get back," Carroll said. The Seahawks, winners of the Super Bowl in the 2013-2014 campaign and runnersup last season, improved to 6-5 after Sunday's win

against the Steelers. — AFP

PULL YOUR SOCKS UP! INDIA, NO LONGER BAREFOOT, REBOOT WORLD AMBITIONS

NEW DELHI: A reluctance to wear football boots at the 1950 World Cup is blamed for casting India into the soccer wilderness, but decades later the giant country is making real efforts to get back in the game. Buoyed by a rising economic tide, football will return to India in a big way with the Under-17 World Cup in two years' time, an event which officials hope is just the start.

Already India's football federation has its eye on hosting the Under-20 World Cup, as well as the Club World Cup, a prestigious tournament which features some of the sport's biggest stars. It's a far cry from India's fateful withdrawal from the first post-war World Cup in 1950 in Brazil, after they won Asia's qualifying spot by default when the other teams all pulled out.

The reasoning behind India's withdrawal remains obscure, but travel difficulties, a failure to grasp the event's importance, and the rule that their barefoot players must wear boots are all cited. With India mere bystanders, Uruguay stunned Brazil in the final match and World Cup lore was set in motion, with football later rising to become a true global game with revenues and visibility to match. "The Indian team opted out... we didn't want to play with shoes," said All India Football Federation president Praful Patel. "So India actually had an entry into the World Cup and we opted out of playing the World Cup. And then of course, once you've missed the bus, the whole world just flew by and we were left way behind."

Hate mail

Sixty-five years later, India has never again come close to contesting a World Cup, languishing at 172nd in the rankings and losing a recent qualifier to the tiny Pacific territory of Guam. But football is at least gaining traction in the cricket-dominated country of 1.2 billion, with two professional leagues including the two-year-old Indian Super League, featuring a list of fading stars. "As the All India Football Federation we receive so much of hate mail and brickbats. I don't blame anybody for that but we also have to understand that we cannot transform Indian football overnight, it has to be a process," Patel said.

"I think the time is for everybody to pull up their socks, work together, heart and soul and minds, and let's make India really rock," he added. Patel was speaking at the launch of the Under-17 World Cup, which took place with Bollywood actors and a typical touch of chaos at a luxury hotel in New Delhi. After a half-hour delay to get the set ready, a ceremonial ball was handed over and highlights of the last U-17 World Cup in Chile were screened by overhead projector, to a soundtrack played at ear-splitting volume.

With memories still fresh of New Delhi's embarrassing 2010 Commonwealth Games, plagued by delays and corruption, Patel said no major problems were expected-but he admitted it would be a challenge to get the venues ready on time. Under-17 coach Nicolai Adam warned that India would also find it hard on the pitch, with their rival teams featuring many players honed by the world's finest football academies. But he said there would be no disgrace for India, even if they are on the wrong end of some big scorelines. "For me, an embarrassment is if you run away from big challenges," said the German. "Maybe we will get smashed 6-0, but it will not be an embarrassment for this country." Embarrassment or not, one thing is certain for India-at this World Cup, they will be wearing boots. — AFP

TORONTO: Garret Sparks became the first Maple Leafs goalie with a shutout in his NHL debut, lifting Toronto over the Edmonton Oilers 3-0 on Monday. Sparks made 24 saves in the Leafs' first shutout since Jonathan Bernier blanked the Dallas Stars on Dec 23, 2014, Leo Komarov scored twice and Nazem Kadri also had a goal to help Toronto snap a three-game skid. James van Riemsdyk added three assists. Anders Nilsson turned away 23 of 25 shots and the Oilers wrapped up their five-game trip at 1-3-1. Both teams had only a shot apiece through the first 10 minutes. Komarov opened the scoring with his team-leading and career high ninth goal of the season on the power play 6:45 into the first.

DUCKS 4, CANUCKS 0

John Gibson made 25 saves for his third career shutout to lead Anaheim over Vancouver. Shawn Horcoff, Rickard Rakell, Jakob Silfverberg and Corey Perry scored and Anaheim won for only the second time in its last five games. 10 different Anaheim players had a point in its biggest rout of the season. The Avalanche nearly scored off the opening faceoff, but Greiss robbed Matt Duchene with a left-pad save. Colorado took the lead 10:20 in. After Greiss stopped Comeau's original shot, the winger circled the net and flipped the rebound over Greiss. The goalie unwittingly knocked it in with the top of his stick.

The Avalanche limited the Islanders to seven first-period shots and very nearly carried a one-goal advantage into the first intermission. But Cody McLeod and Gabriel Landeskog each took penalties in the final minute, and Okposo buried a snap shot with 1.4 seconds left.

Grabovski gave the Islanders their first lead at 6:31 of the second. But just 41 seconds later, Iginla's seeing-eye wrist shot confounded Greiss and tied the game 2-2. The goal was Iginla's 597th of his career, leaving him four shy of Jari Kurri for 18th place on the career list. The Islanders peppered the Avalanche cage, aiming to break the tie late in the second period, but Varlamov was outstanding. The Avs goalie has struggled at points this season but stopped 13 of 14 in the frame as the Islanders recorded seven of the period's final eight shots after Iginla's goal. — Agencies

RED-HOT ASHWIN LOOKING TO COMPOUND S AFRICA AGONY

NEW DELHI: India's red-hot spinner Ravichandran Ashwin will look to pile on the agony for South Africa in the final Test in New Delhi starting tomorrow on a pitch expected to cause more problems for the tourists. The 29-year-old has risen to number two in the world rankings following his heroics in last week's third Test in Nagpur when he recorded match figures of 12 for 98, giving India an unassailable 2-0 series lead.

Ashwin has taken 55 wickets since the start of the year, more than anyone else in Test cricket, and has been near unplayable on the rank turners that have bamboozled South Africa's stellar batting line-up. "He is a world class spinner, probably the best in the world right now," India captain Virat Kohli said in the aftermath of Ashwin's performance in Nagpur. "He's stepped up in a big way for us, even in (the last series against) Sri Lanka. He is one of the main reasons why we've been able to win back-to-back series."

Both India's victories in Nagpur and Mohali have been wrapped up inside three days, and South Africa were also bowled out cheaply in their only innings in the rainaffected second Test in Bangalore which was drawn. The Proteas' most reliable batsmen, Hashim Amla and A B de Villiers, have managed one half century between them in the series while no one has made a century. The likes of Dean Elgar, Stiaan van Zyl and Faf du Plessis, who are all on their first tour of India, have fared little better. Amla has admitted that it has been a struggle for the batsmen in conditions he says have been some of the most challenging he has ever faced.

More of the same

"I think the wickets have played their part in making it very difficult for all the batters," said the South African skipper. While they remain the world's number one Test team, the tourists have had to endure the disappointment of losing their first series abroad in nine years. While they will be desperate to avoid a 3-0 scoreline, the Ferozeshah Kotla pitch is expected to pose similar challenges for the Proteas who have struggled to produce a top-class spinner of their own. "I would hope the one in Delhi is absolutely the same.

I have no qualms about it," the Indian team director Ravi Shastri told the Cricinfo website, saying it was up to batsmen to adjust their technique. "Which rule tells me that a ball can't turn on day one? Where does it tell me in the rule book it can only swing and seam?"

South Africa's cause has not been helped by the absence of their pace spearhead Dale Steyn, the only bowler above Ashwin in the world rankings. Steyn, nursing a groin strain, has bowled just 11 overs in the series and it looks unlikely the visitors will risk him in a dead rubber.

The performance of Steyn's usual strike partner Morne Morkel has been one of the few bright spots for the visitors and he was the pick of the South African bowlers in Nagpur. While India's line-up is expected to be unchanged, South Africa could be tempted to hand back-up seamers Kyle Abbott and Marchant de Lange a chance to impress ahead of the upcoming home series against England and give Kagiso

WAQAR BELIEVES ENGLAND DEFEAT 'HUGE EYE OPENER'

SHARJAH: Pakistan head coach Waqar Younis described defeat in the Twenty20 series against England as a "huge eye opener" for his team whose "poor and ordinary" performance needed proper analysis. Pakistan were blanked 3-0 by England who won the third and final game in Sharjah in a thrilling Super Over finish on Monday-leaving Waqar to ponder his side's progress just four months before the World Twenty20 in India. "I think it's a big eye opener," said Waqar. "We have seen a lot of things which were not obvious before and there was an obvious difference between the two teams. "Our performance has been very ordinary and very poor and needs serious analysis." Pakistan were cruising along nicely in their chase of a 155-run target but faltered in the last over, leaving scores level at 154. Chris Jordan conceded only three runs in the Super Over which England overhauled off four deliv-

Waqar praised England

"England were younger than us and fitter and I think that made the difference. Credit to them for bouncing back after losing the Test series," said Waqar whose team won the preceding three-Test series 2-0 but lost the four-match one-day 3-1. "Twenty20 is fast cricket and that's why we couldn't match them," said Waqar of England who have now won six consecutive Twenty20 matches and displaced Pakistan to sixth from second in T20 rankings. Waqar admitted some of his talented players including the indisci-

plined Umar Akam

plined Umar Akaml were not learning. "I don't know, I dont have the answer why they are not performing," said Waqar of Umar who was initially dropped from the team for a discipline violation. "They are not young like 18 or 19 and as far as the opportunities are concerned everyone, selectors and cricket board, know they get the most opportunities so I think selectors will have to think. "Don't know about saying goodbye to them, it's not my job to say goodbye but selectors would have been watching so they must have assessed the performance and fitness and they would be considering that."Umar and Sohaib Maqsood managed just 26 each while Ahmed Shehzad scored 32 in three matches.

Waqar said his players were committing schoolboy errors. "To be very honest run outs are a huge problem," said Waqar whose players have been run out 34 times in international matches this year, 21 in one-day matches.

"The manner in which they got run out is a schoolboy error, it's not that you are playing new players, these players are seasoned and that's not on, to be honest. "Individuals have to think, are they worried about getting out? it's a worrying sign and if individuals come under pressure like this then its not good for them as well as for the team.

Waqar pointed out fitness as the key problem. "It's an important part to have fitness camps back home and the national cricket academy has got to start rolling and these guys should be launched there to get fit." — AFP

INDIA TO FACE ICC SANCTION OVER 'POOR' NAGPUR PITCH

NEW DELHI: Indian cricket authorities face a fine of up to \$15,000 after the pitch used for the spin-dominated third test between India and South Africa in Nagpur was rated as "poor" by match referee Jeff Crowe, the International Cricket Council (ICC) said yesterday. Forty wickets tumbled in three days at the VCA Stadium as India beat South Africa by 124 runs with more than two days to spare in the low-scoring contest to take an unassailable 2-0 lead in the fourmatch series. "Jeff Crowe submitted his report to the ICC, expressing the concerns of the match officials over the performance of the pitch," the ICC said in a statement. The report has been forwarded to the Indian cricket board (BCCI), which

now has 14 days to respond.

After that, ICC general manager of cricket Geoff Allardice and chief match referee Ranjan Madugalle will rule whether the pitch was poor and whether it warrants a penalty. ICC rules decree that if they confirm that the pitch was "poor", a warning can be issued and/or "a fine not exceeding \$15,000 (imposed), with a directive for appropriate corrective action". The Nagpur pitch offered prodigious turn from day one, prompting Australian all-rounder Glenn Maxwell to call it "diabolical", while former Australia opener Matthew Hayden termed it a "Bunsen burner"-slang for a turner.

Indian opener Murali Vijay's first-innings 40

was the highest individual score in the test, in which South Africa mustered just 79 in the first innings and lost all 20 wickets in the match to spinners.

Visiting captain Hashim Amla said the Nagpur track was the "toughest" he had faced in his test career, but assistant coach Adrian Birrell refused to blame the pitches for the team's series defeat.

"We're not complaining at all," Birell told reporters at the Feroze Shah Kotla Stadium, in Delhi yesterday ahead of the fourth and final test, which begins on Thursday. "We're playing in India and we're playing in Indian conditions. We relish the opportunity. Unfortunately, we've not played to our full potential."— Reuters

COMMONWEALTH GAMES WANTS CRICKET BACK AT THE CREASE

MANIKATA: The Commonwealth Games is in talks with the International Cricket Council about bringing the sport back into the four-yearly event, organizers said. The Commonwealth Games Federation, which controls the second-biggest multi-sport event after the Olympics, said it was keen to get cricket back on the bill, with the Twenty20 shortest format of the game a particularly "exciting" prospect. Cricket has only featured once at the Commonwealth Games, at the 1998 event in Kuala Lumpur, but CGF chiefs said their 71 national and territorial associations wanted it back in, provided a viable format could be produced.

"We've had some fantastic conversations with the ICC. It's very much exploratory," CGF chief executive David Grevemberg said at the Commonwealth summit in Malta. "(It's) one of the priorities of the movement: all 71 nations and territories unanimously agreed that it would be great to have cricket as part of the sports program. "It's not out of the question and, working with the ICC, we could come up with a really relevant and exciting format." At the 1998 Games, 16 teams competed in 50-over matches.

Caribbean countries competed separately rather than as West Indies, while a Northern Ireland team also took part. England refused to send a squad as it clashed with the end of the domestic championship season. South Africa beat Australia in the gold medal match. Cricket is not on the agenda for the 2018 Games in the Gold Coast, Australia, but could potentially feature at the 2022 Games in Durban, South Africa.

Prevent whitewashes

CGF president Louise Martin said West Indies countries such as Jamaica and Barbados would "love" the chance to compete in a global tournament in their own right. Therefore, "it would be completely different" to existing international cricket tournaments, she said. "Let's think outside the box and open it up." She said any

Commonwealth Games cricket competition would have to involve countries from each region, and give minor nations worthwhile matches and something to play for.

The format must also be carefully structured also to avoid major teams playing pointless onesided matches against weaker opposition, the former Scotland swimmer said. "We need to encourage smaller countries to be able to compete at major Games," she said. However, "you have to look at the whole structure and what the strength in depth is. We don't want whitewashes. I would hate to think that anyone going in against Australia or India are thinking they're going to get nought. That's not what this is about". She stressed discussions with the ICC were still in the initial phases. "We'd like to have it back in again. The Twenty20 format makes its so much more exciting and you can do it in a shorter period of time, but at this moment it's still in discussion stage." — AFP

AUSTRALIA TURN TO COULTER-NILE, PATTINSON FOR WINDIES OPENER

ADELAIDE: Australia yesterday turned to James Pattinson and Nathan Coulter-Nile to replenish their diminishing fast bowling ranks for next week's opening Test against the West Indies. Selectors named the pace duo in a 12-man squad for the December 10-14 Hobart Test following a stress fracture foot injury to Mitchell Starc on top of the recent retirement of Mitchell Johnson.

The panel is also mulling the pressing need to give Adelaide Test man-of-the-match Josh Hazlewood some time off to refresh as Australia face a three-Test series against the West Indies and two return Tests in New Zealand in February. Pattinson, 25, played the last of his 13 Tests against South Africa in March 2014 with his career stalled by chronic back and hamstring issues. Coulter-Nile, 28, has been included despite not playing any domestic Sheffield Shield matches so far this summer because of a shoulder injury.

mer because of a shoulder injury.

He should have bowled for Western Australia last weekend but was given a one-match ban for showing dissent at an umpire's decision in the domestic second XI league, meaning he has not played first-class cricket since the Sheffield Shield final in March."We've had our eye on Nathan for a long time. We've been very pleased with the way he's played when he has played," selector Rod Marsh told reporters. "But he's been a fast bowler who hasn't been injury-free and I guess we are at the situation now because of the two Mitchells, one injured and one retiring, that we do need a bit of pace up front, so he's in the 12."Once Mitchell Starc went down everyone's mind turned straight

to Nathan Coulter-Nile."

Senior quick Peter Siddle, who has become

even more important to Australia's plans with the pressures on the pace brigade, experienced back problems during last weekend's day-night third Test against New Zealand in Adelaide. As a precaution selectors have placed Scott Boland on standby in case of further injury problems heading into the Test. "Hopefully, all the bowlers from the Adelaide Test recover well over the next few days but we are mindful our fast bowlers have had a heavy workload over this series," Marsh said.

Marsh spoke of the conundrum facing selectors over Hazlewood's recent workload. He bowled a total of 119 overs in the recent New Zealand series. "It will be very difficult for Josh Hazlewood to get through six Tests in a summer and then go to New Zealand and play two more and we also have a one-day series against India," Marsh said.

"So we'll see how he's tracking, if he's strong and he's fit. "It helps if you don't have to play five-day Test matches too. The last couple of days of a Test match can be quite difficult for a fast bowler." Given Australia's current fast bowling predicament, Marsh was asked if he had considered talking Johnson out of retirement. "I thought about it," he said jokingly. "No, you have to respect a bloke when he retires. "There's a reason why he wanted to retire and he didn't want to play any more, it's simple as that. You don't go there." — AFP

BULLS HALT SPURS' FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK

SALT LAKE CITY: Stephen Curry scored 26 points as the Golden State Warriors held on for their NBArecord 19th consecutive win to start the season. 106-103 over the Utah Jazz on Monday night. With the game tied at 101 with 51 seconds left, Curry hit a 3-pointer from the left wing to give the Warriors the lead. Rodney Hood scored 14 seconds later to bring the Jazz within one. After Curry missed a 3, the Jazz had a chance to take the lead, but Hood missed a 3 from the wing with 5 seconds left. Curry hit two free throws and Gordon Hayward's halfcourt heave at the buzzer fell way short. Klay Thompson added 20 points for the Warriors, including four 3-pointers. CELTICS 105, HEAT 95



No 1 UCONN DOWN CHATTANOOGA 79-31

CHATTANOOGA: Moriah Jefferson tor. Connecticut beat Foster's Ohio scored 15 points and didn't miss a shot Monday night as No 1 UConn breezed past Chattanooga 79-31 for its 41st consecutive victory. The Huskies' winning streak is the fourthlongest in school history. This marked the seventh time the two good friends had faced off, and it was Auriemma's fourth straight victory over his former men- 42-5 the rest of the way. — AP

State team in 2010 and knocked off Foster's Vanderbilt squads in the 1996 NCAA Tournament and the 2001 Preseason WNIT. Foster beat Connecticut while at St. Joe's in 1987 and while at Vanderbilt in the 1991 NCAA Tournament and in December 1992. ONEASIA'S FOOTHOLD IN Australia under threat

SYDNEY: OneAsia's continuing presence in Australia looked far from assured as the seventh season of the struggling Asia-Pacific golf tour drew to a close in Sydney last weekend. The PGA of Australia was one of the main driving forces behind the establishment of OneAsia in 2009 but in June it dropped the tour from its oldest event, the Australian PGA Championship.

The European Tour will instead debut as co-sanctioners of the tournament on the Gold Coast this week, leaving the Australian Open as the last remaining stop Down Under on a shrinking OneAsia schedule. Asked about the longterm future of the relationship between the Australian Open and OneAsia at the weekend, Golf Australia chief executive Stephen Pitt was non-committal. "I guess, it's hard to look at it for the next four or five years because it's a very dynamic area, there's a lot going on with tours," he told reporters on Sunday.

"So at the moment we're looking at some of those things with our commercial partner Lagardere ... we'll make those decisions at the appropriate time.

"There'll be some tour options without a doubt. But I'd say it's an interesting time in terms of the tour landscape." The interesting times have been brought about by talks over a proposed merger between the fast-expanding European Tour and the Asian Tour, a player-run organization that preceded OneAsia and bitterly opposed its establishment. Pitt said the decision over the future alignment of the tournament would ultimately be taken by Lagardere, formerly the World Sport Group, and Golf Australia.

Lagardere are a major player in the Asian golf market and have been long-time global marketing and media partner of the OneAsia tour. Mark Hardess, their president of southeast Asia and Australia, did not want to specifically discuss the relative merits of aligning with various tours but did explain the reasons for co-sanctioning. "For us, the more can link Australia to Asia and the huge population up there, hopefully that's a bigger and better proposition and brings money back into the event," he told Reuters on Sunday. "Particularly on our broadcast platform.

We try and get Chinese, Japa-

nese, Korean, southeast Asian players in there because people obviously follow their own.

"So that's the whole purpose of looking to sanction with whatever partner up in Asia is to get Asian lads in here so they get seen on television up there and people follow us. "OneAsia was the link into Asia but it could have been with any Asian tour, we could have just gone to the Japanese, to the Koreans, to the Chinese. OneAsia was just one conversation instead of three." The prospect of a tour that could bring big names from not only Asia but also Europe might be highly attractive to an event like the Australian Open, which has been revived from a fairly moribund state over the last few years.

Parlous state

It was the generally parlous state of the Australasian tour, with its best homegrown talent heading to the US and Europe and cut off from the potential riches of the Asian market, that led to the formation of OneAsia.

With the Australian PGA, China Golf Association, Korean Golf Association and the Korean PGA on board, the new tour was launched with ambitious plans of 20-to-30 events a year each with a prize purse above one million dollars. But for branding on the TV pictures, however, you would have hardly have noticed that last weekend's Australian Open was the final stop on its schedule. South Korea's Moon Kyong-jun was crowned Order of Merit winner after the event but there was no presentation as he was not among the OneAsia members playing at the Australian Golf Club.

The schedule was reduced to seven events this year after the cancellation of the Indonesian PGA and China Masters as well as the loss of the Australian PGA. "We've struggled, it's been a difficult year," David Parkin, OneAsia's Director of Tour Operations, told Reuters on a Sunday as he fulfilled his role a cotournament director.

"But we're still offering our members the chance to earn good money and play in big tournaments and that's what it's about at the end of the day. "Hopefully we'll have a couple more tournaments next year, we're hoping to have the China Masters and the Indonesian PGA back," he added. "I'm positive about the future."— Reuters

"I am happy to be among the top three, to be going to another gala and be

there with Ney," said Messi, who is a finalist for a ninth consecutive year. "I would have liked for Luis to be there too because he deserved it for the year he had, but we can't also take away credit from Cristiano and he deserves it too." In contrast to Messi and Ronaldo, Neymar is nominated among the top three for the first time. "It is one of the happiest days of my life," said the Brazilian star. "Suarez is missing. I was hoping that he would be there too." — AFP

MCLAREN GROUP PLANS 'GIANT STEP'

LONDON: McLaren are planning a "giant step" forward as a company that will give their Formula One team more muscle to take on mighty Mercedes and Ferrari, group head Ron Dennis said after a dismal 2015 season on the track. The sport's second most successful team finished ninth out of 10 this year, their worst ever performance and first season of a new partnership with Honda. The former champions last won a race in 2012.

Without a title sponsor, McLaren have seen some prominent partners depart to rivals and will lose out on tens of millions of dollars in revenues due to their lowly placing in the championship. Dennis said however that the group as a whole was doing well, with equity value of more than £1 billion (\$1.51 billion). "Our objective as shareholders is always to think about growth," he said at last weekend's Abu Dhabi season-ender in response to a question about shareholdings and whether he had acquired part of a stake owned by Bahrain's Mumtalakat state holding company.

"Whilst I completely understand the interest in who owns what, the actual process we are going through at the moment is how can we be bigger, stronger? How can we start to build our organisation to match the sort of resources that some of the other players have?"

McLaren changed their name last year to McLaren Technology Group, incorporating the car company and applied technologies as well as the F1 team. The F1 side now represents between 34 and 38 percent of the business. "We are strong, very strong, financially," said Dennis. He said reinvestment of profits was one way to achieve growth but McLaren were looking at a "completely different" approach. "That's been focusing my mind for four months at least and has been the primary reason why you haven't seen me at the grands prix," he explained. "As and when we get there, if we get there, to where I think will allow us to take a giant step for McLaren, we will share it with the media."— Reuters

Woods has no timetable ON HEALING OR PLAYING

NASSAU, Bahamas: Tiger Woods painted a bleak picture yesterday on when he can return to golf or even get back to doing anything more than just walking. Woods had two back surgeries in a span of 18 months followed by what he described only as another "procedure" in the same area last month. He has not started rehabilitation and does not know when his back will allow for that. "The hardest part for me is there's really nothing I can look forward to, nothing I can build toward," Woods said. "It's just taking it literally just day by day and week by week and time by time."

Woods is at the Hero World Challenge as the tournament host, not one of the 18 players at Albany Golf Club. The only time he touched a club was to pose for a photo, and he leaned on it while talking to Justin Rose and Zach Johnson on the putting green. A month away from turning 40, the smile did come as easily for Woods. He has not competed since Aug 23 at the Wyndham Championship in Greensboro, North Carolina, where he attracted record crowds in his first appearance and played his best golf of a bad year. He went into the final round two shots behind and tied for 10th.

He didn't realize that would be his last event of the year, and last tournament for longer than he knows. "Was it a surprise? Yeah," Woods said. "Because as I was alluding to that week and subsequent weeks, I felt my hip was killing me and I didn't think it was coming from my back. We worked out in the trailer each and every day and just tried to loosen up my hip. And OK, fine, we went out and played. But I didn't feel any back discomfort. "Come to find out it wasn't my hip, it was coming from my back."

He had another microdiscectomy Sept 16 and then he revealed Oct 30 another "procedure", which he said was in the same spot. Asked the degree to which he can function, Woods said, "I walk. I walk and I walk some more." Woods, who has spent 683 weeks at No. 1 in the world ranking, is now at No. 400, his lowest as a professional. He has not won since the Bridgestone Invitational in 2013, when he was the PGA Tour player of the year.

And now he can't even begin to imagine when he might play again. "I have no answer for that, and neither does my surgeon or my physios," he said. "There is no timetable." Woods said this was different from his four knee surgeries, even the worst one in 2008 after he won the US Open at Torrey Pines for his 14th major. He had a reconstruction of his left knee and was told it would be about nine months before he could get back. Woods returned eight months later and won in his third start. "For nerves, there are really no timetables and therein lies the tricky part of it because you can come back earlier or you can come back later. It just depends on how the nerve heals and how it settles," he said.

Just a Host?

Would he be surprised if he was nothing more than a host at the Hero World Challenge a year from now? He couldn't answer it. "So where is the light at the end of the tunnel? I don't cheerleader." — AP

He agreed to be a vice captain under Davis Love III at the Ryder Cup next year, though Woods still wants to play in the matches. He says it has been two months since he hit a golf ball -"a chip shot left handed" - and that he passes most his time playing video games. Woods said he wants to play again and that anything he accomplishes the rest of his career "will be gravy.'

But he sounded at peace with what he already has done - 79 career victories on the PGA Tour (second only to the 82 by Sam Snead), 14 majors (second to 18 by Jack Nicklaus), PGA Tour player of the year a record 11 times. "I've had a pretty good career for my 20s and 30s," he said. "For my 20 years out here, I think I've achieved a lot, and if that's all it entails, then I've had a pretty good run. But I'm hoping that's not it. I'm hoping that I can get back out here and compete against these guys. I really do miss it."

The first step? Getting healthy enough to play soccer with his two children. "If I can get to that, then we can start talking about golf," he said. "But let me get to where I can pass the time and really be a part of my kids' life in the way that I want to be part of it physically, not just as a

LEBRON ON KOBE RETIREMENT: WANTED TO BE JUST LIKE HIM

CLEVELAND: When he was a kid, LeBron James looked up on his bedroom wall where Kobe Bryant hung in reverence. "I wanted to be just like him, man," James said yesterday. Two days after Bryant announced he would retire after this season, James expressed his gratitude and love for the US Olympic teammate who pushed him to greatness and will leave the NBA as one of its most celebrated players.

Following Cleveland's morning shoot-around before playing Washington, James spent several minutes reflecting on Bryant's career and the impact he had on the Cavaliers star. "We've always competed against one another and we always wanted to dethrone each other," James said. "But we always had that mutual respect because we knew how much we put into the game. I've always voiced my opinion about Kobe, how great Kobe is, and obviously there will never be another one of him in our league. Ever."

James spent much of his interview session prais-

ing Bryant, who announced Sunday that his 20th NBA season will be his last. Bryant begins his farewell tour Tuesday night in Philadelphia, the city where his basketball journey began. As Bryant was taking his first steps in what would become a stellar career, James was in Akron, Ohio, doing everything he could

to mimic a player with unrivaled offensive skills. "In high school I wore a nappy afro because of Kobe Bryant," James said. "I always said my inspiration came from Jordan, but I always thought Jordan was so out of this world that I could never get there. Kobe was someone that I just always kind of wanted to be like and play like. And then, just being a competitor, he took me to that next level, and understanding how important competition is and just

have a willingness to never die." James rattled off some of Bryant's signature games and moves: His 81-point game in 2006, a game-winning shot against Phoenix, a tip dunk against Indiana, a behind-the-back, 360-degree

dunk against Denver. James can replay all of them in his mind, and he's struggling with the idea that he'll never get to see Bryant add to that list. "To know that it's coming to an end is truly sad for me," he said.

During his offseason workouts, James said the thought of Bryant being in a gym somewhere else, perfecting his crossover or that unstoppable fadeaway jumper, pushed him to do more. "I knew I had to be better because of Kobe Bryant," he said. "I knew he was in the gym and I knew he was working on his game. And I knew he was great. So every day that I didn't want to work out or every day I felt like I couldn't give more, I always thought of Kobe. I knew that he was getting better and I was like, 'Man, if you take a day off, he's going to take advantage of it. You cannot take a day off. You cannot take a day off.' And I used him for my motivation throughout my career because I always knew that he was working on something. So, that part will be missed a little bit." — AP

HIGUAIN AT THE DOUBLE AS NAPOLI GO TOP OF SERIE A

MILAN: Gonzalo Higuain struck in either half as Napoli toppled 10-man Inter Milan 2-1 in a spectacular clash at the San Paolo to go top of the Serie A table on Monday. Inter travelled south for the first big away test of what they hope will be a title-winning campaign, but with just a two-point cushion on a Napoli side whose last defeat came on the opening day of the season. Inter were shell-shocked by the lightning start of Maurizio Sarri's men and their hopes of staying top suffered a blow when Yuto Nagatomo saw red a minute before the interval.

But Inter regrouped and Adem Ljajic reduced arrears on the hour with a fine individual strike. Yet despite a battling finish that saw the visitors hit the woodwork twice, it wasn't enough to stop Napoli going a point clear at the top for the first time this season. Inter drop to second with Fiorentina, held 1-1 at Sassuolo earlier Monday, a point further off the pace in third. Higuain and Napoli's players milked the applause at an appreciative San Paolo and the Argentina striker dedicated taking his league-leading tally for the season to 12 goals to the city and the fans.

"It's a magic night. I'm happy for the fans, for the team and for the people of Napoli," Higuain told Sky Sport. "I think we deserve it, it's not often we're in the lead. The season is still long, but we have to capitalize on going top." Roma's shock 2-0 home defeat to Atalanta has left embattled Rudi Garcia's side in fourth at four points behind Napoli, with champions

Juventus now up to fifth, at seven points off the pace. Napoli began at break-neck speed and a panicky Inter were made to pay for Jeison Murillo's mis-hit clearance on the edge of the area when it found its way to Higuain via a deft touch from Jose Callejon.

The Argentinean was left in space on the right and coolly volleyed past Samir Handanovic. Nagatomo, who had earlier been cautioned for a foul on Callejon, was given his marching orders, rather harshly, when he was cautioned for a second time after sliding in late but without malice to challenge Allan, who was left writhing on the ground. Mancini hit out at the officiating when he told to Premium Sport: "Nagatomo didn't deserve his first yellow card, Callejon simulated the foul. The red card that sent Nagatomo off for a half-foul was decisive. "Without the red, we wouldn't have lost."

But when asked about Inter's biggest tormentor, Mancini didn't hide: "Higuain's an amazing striker. You give him half a ball and he scores." Mancini introduced full-back Alex Telles for striker Mauro Icardi but Napoli soon added to their tally. Higuain's 12th league goal this season took him clear of Sampdoria striker Eder. Inter reduced arrears minutes later when Ljajic fired low into the near bottom corner through a crowd of defenders.

MILNER EYEING FIRST TROPHY WITH IMPROVING LIVERPOOL

LIVERPOOL: Liverpool have hit form at the right time ahead of a season-defining month with a first trophy possible under new manager Juergen Klopp, midfielder James Milner has said. The Merseysiders, who have won six of their last seven games in all competitions, play seven times in December and kick-off the hectic schedule away to Southampton in the quarter final of the League Cup today. "This is always a crucial period. The league table always looks so much different at the beginning to mid-January than what he does at the start of December," Milner was quoted as saying by British media. "You see suspensions and injuries taking hold and teams losing and gaining form. It is a great time to be in good form going into this Christmas period and hopefully we can keep it going."

Liverpool's last trophy was the 2012 League Cup and the former Manchester City midfielder said he was optimistic the club, who are sixth in the Premier League, could end their wait for silverware. "It is a talented squad of players, we have a great mix of youth and experience and obviously a new manager. It is exciting times for everyone," Milner said. "If we keep working hard, keep improving, keep doing our job then hopefully we can be successful. We just want to keep getting the wins on the board. "Hopefully get into January and February and still be in all the cup competitions and give ourselves a shot in one of the cups."— Reuters

CHELSEA SUBMIT PLANS FOR NEW 60,000-SEAT GROUND

LONDON: Chelsea have submitted a planning application to build a new 60,000-seat stadium on the site of their Stamford Bridge ground, the Premier League champions announced yesterday. "A planning application for a new stadium at Stamford Bridge with an expanded seating capacity has been submitted," the club said in a statement. "This follows a successful consultation process during which we received very helpful feedback." The plans involve the demolition of the current stadium at Stamford Bridge, where Chelsea have played since 1905, and the construction of a new arena fea-

turing a club shop and museum, plus restaurants and cafes. Stamford Bridge, in west London, last underwent major renovation in the late 1990s when the stadium's West Stand was rebuilt. The ground's current 41,798 capacity restricts Chelsea's ability to maximize match-day revenues. According to the most recent figures compiled by financial analysts Deloitte, Chelsea generated 85 million euros (\$90.1 million) in match-day revenue in the 2013-14 season. In comparison, London rivals Arsenal, whose Emirates Stadium holds 60,260, raised 120 million euros, while Manchester United, who can fit 75,653 people into Old Trafford, generated 129 million euros. —AFP

SPORTING SNATCH VICTORY AGAINST HAPLESS BELENENSES; BENFICA WIN

LISBON: Sporting's Willam Carvalho converted a stoppage-time penalty to give the Portuguese league leaders a 1-0 home win over hapless Belenenses who defended gallantly for 90 minutes on Monday. Sporting stay five points clear of Porto, who won 1-0 at Tondela on Saturday. Champions Benfica got two early goals to win 2-0 at Braga and move above their opponents into third. Belenenses suffered a cruel late blow as they appeared to be on the verge of taking a deserved point from Sporting until the ball hit defender Tonel's raised hand as he went up for a header with Islam Slimani and the referee pointed

to the spot.
It was not clear whether the handball

was intentional or not, but Carvalho made no mistake as he fired home the penalty. "We reached the shore and died on the beach," said Belenenses defender Goncalo Brandao. The highlight of the game at the Alvalade was an individual effort by Sporting forward Bryan Ruiz in the first half. The Costa Rican collected the ball in midfield, ghosted past a defender, jinked his way into the area, slipped through two more defenders and saw his shot tipped away by Hugo Ventura. Benfica's Pizzi scored in the third minute after Kostas Mitroglou opened up Braga's defense with a clever backheel and defender Lisandro Lopez turned in the second after 11 minutes. — Reuters

CHELSEA-TARGET MUELLER 'IRREPLACABLE' AT BAYERN

BERLIN: Chelsea are the latest Premier League club reported to be chasing Germany forward Thomas Mueller, but as far as Bayern Munich are concerned their maverick star is 'irreplacable'. According to UK media reports, Jose Mourinho's Blues want to sign Mueller to replace Diego Costa, hardly surprising given the German's current goal-scoring prowess. Mueller netted Bayern's opener in Saturday's 2-0 win at home to Hertha Berlin to claim his 13th league goal, just four months into the season. It means he has scored in each of his last five competitive outings, taking his astonishing personal haul to 20 goals in 21 outings in all competitions in 2015/16. In a single season, he has never scored more than his current tally of 13 Bundesliga goalswhich has come after only 14 matches.

Still just 26, Mueller already has a World Cup winners medal in his collection and can play on the wing or as a striker, as he proved by scoring a hat-trick against Portugal at the 2014 World Cup. Bayern have tied Mueller up with a contract until June 2019 and he has an estimated market value of 75 million euros (\$79.55m), but the sky's the limit in terms of what a Premier League club would potentially have to pay for him. "Thomas Mueller embodies everything which distinguishes FC Bayern Munich," enthused the club's director of sport Matthias Sammer. "He is an absolute role model, an absolute gem and he's irreplaceable." Mueller is not your typical footballer, who tends to be more interested in fast cars and supermodel girlfriends.

Mueller got married shortly after his 20th birthday in November 2009, his wife Lisa is a successful equestrian rider and at the last count, the couple have seven horses. Mueller has even tried his hand at horse breeding. He insists he is just an average guy and his name is so typically German that 700,000 countrymen share the same combination, except the Bayern Star has nearly nine million followers on Facebook. The joker of the team, whether playing for Germany or Bayern, Mueller is more likely to be seen pulling a face or pranking a team-mate than boarding the team bus wearing the trade-

mark oversized headphones most footballers prefer.

Good over 10kms

Bastian Schweinsteiger famously quipped that the best thing about joining Manchester United at the start of the season is that he "wouldn't have to travel with Thomas Mueller anymore" to Bayern's away matches. But Mueller's trademark talent is for being in the right place at the right time, which has attracted the interest of England's top clubs. "He just has the nose for it and knows exactly where the ball will land," said Germany captain Schweinsteiger. Mueller is the first to admit that he is not the fastest in a sprint, "but I'm pretty good over 10kms", in reference to his high work rate during matches.

Since breaking into the Bayern team in August 2008, he has often shown a maturity and level-headed approach beyond his years, which is juxtaposed by his taste for clowning around. "I gave no thoughts to the recent past. I am not a guy who is haunted by fear," he said after spending a fraught night with the Germany team in the Stade de France changing rooms during the Paris terror attacks on November 13. This is not the first time a Premier League club has been linked to Mueller. In September, Bayern received an offer from Manchester United which chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge would only describe as 'very high', just weeks after making it clear the Germany star was not for sale. The German media speculated that the United offer was in the region of 100 million euros, which soon prompted a new nickname for Mueller, when a fan shouted "Hey 100 million man, what is your shirt worth?" "It's basically crazy the sums which are thrown around in football, but that's just the business," Mueller said at the time. "Nobody is worth 100 million euros, but it's just a transaction." But former Bayern and Germany midfielder Lothar Matthaeus has warned Mueller to ignore the attention from England and says he should end his career in the Bundesliga. And in terms of Bayern allowing their star player to leave the club, as Rummenigge put it in September, "the door remains closed". — AFP

LAST-GASP DRAMA AS RAVENS STUN BROWNS

NEW YORK: Will Hill returned a last-gasp blocked division at 2-9 and have now lost 14 of their last 16 Ravens scored a dramatic 33-27 win over the Cleveland Browns on Monday. The Ravens had looked set to suffer an agonizing late defeat as Cleveland kicker Travis Coons stepped up for what would have been a game-winning 51-yard field goal with the last play of regulation.

But Baltimore defensive end Brent Urban blocked the kick and safety Hill scooped up the loose ball to gallop down the sideline to snatch a sensational win for the Ravens. "It was almost a game of redemption," Ravens coach John Harbaugh said. "Will Hill didn't do a very good job in coverage. He got fooled a little bit and gave up a touchdown pass. He comes back, picks it up and runs it in. "All the guys on the field-goalblock team set the wall down the sideline. It was a thing of beauty."

The victory saw the Ravens, playing without injured quarterback Joe Flacco, improve to 4-7, although they remain in third in the AFC North standings behind division leaders the Cincinnati Bengals (9-2) and Pittsburgh (6-5). The Browns are last in the

field goal attempt for a touchdown as the Baltimore games stretching back to last season. "It's a tough one to wrap your brain around, Browns coach Mike Pettine said. "It's frustrating. The guys battled back from some deficits. We didn't finish it." Baltimore had looked to have done enough for victory when kicker Justin Tucker converted a 35-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to give the Ravens a 27-20 lead.

> But Cleveland quarterback Austin Davis-pressed into action after Josh McCown left the field with a shoulder injury in the fourth quarter-connected with wide receiver Travis Benjamin on a 42-yard touchdown pass with 1:47 left to tie the game at 27-27. The momentum appeared to be with Cleveland on the final drive as Coons stepped up for his shot at glory. The final twist came, though, when Urban somehow managed to get a hand to the attempt and Hill grabbed the ball to run for the score. Browns kicked Coons was baffled at the missed field goal. "It felt really good coming off my foot," Coons said. "I was really surprised. I don't know if it was me. As soon as it comes off your foot and you hear another thud, that's not a good thing." — AFP

MESSI VOTED 'LA LIGA TOP STRIKER'

MADRID: Barcelona star Lionel Messi, the favorite to win FIFA's prestigious Ballon d'Or title, was on Monday voted the top striker in the Spanish league last season ahead of Real Madrid rival Cristiano Ronaldo. It is the sixth time that the Argentinean has won the title in seven editions of the trophy given by the Spanish football league, with the prize presented during a gala ceremony in Barcelona on Monday night. Messi, who scored 43 goals and was the catalyst for Barcelona's run to three titles last seasonthe Champions League, La Liga and the Spanish Cup was selected following a computer analysis of the players' statistics in the championship.

"I'm proud to receive this award ahead of so many important players in La Liga," said Messi. "This award in particular I want to dedicate to my son Thiago (aged 3) even if he still doesn't understand very well. Every time I leave the house he gets angry and asks me: 'Papa, are you going again to score goals?'This award is for him." Messi also won the vote for the best striker following a poll of the captains of each of Spain's top flight sides. Barcelona's Claudio Bravo was voted the best goalkeeper and Luis Enrique top coach while Real Madrid's Sergio Ramos and James Rodriguez were named best defender and midfielder

. Valencia's Algerian midfielder Sofiane

Feghouli was voted the top African player and Barcelona's Brazilian striker Neymar, the best player from the American continent. Real Madrid's Portuguese star Ronaldo, who scored the most La Liga goals last season with 48, won the publics' choice award. Ronaldo, Messi and Neymar were all named on Monday's shortlist for FIFA's Ballon d'Or which will be awarded on January 11. While Ronaldo has triumphed over the last two seasons (in a total of three wins), Messi has previously claimed the coveted award four times while Neymar makes the shortlist for the first time. Neymar, 23, said it was "a great honor" to be named for the first time alongside his illustrious La Liga rivals. — AFP

CHINA PLANTS ITS FLAG IN **ENGLISH PREMIER LEAGUE**

Investors buy 13% stake in Man City for \$400m

LONDON: China planted its flag in the English Premier League yesterday as a consortium of Chinese investors bought a 13 percent stake in Manchester City's parent company for \$400 million (377 million euros). China Media Capital (CMC) and CITIC Capital have purchased the stake in City Football Group (CFG), which had previously been wholly owned by the Abu Dhabi United Group (ADUG), just weeks after Chinese President Xi Jinping visited the club.

The deal is part of the CFG's strategy of expanding into Chinese football and reflects Xi's aim to turn his country into a "football powerhouse". "The deal will create an unprecedented platform for the growth of CFG clubs and companies in China and internationally, borne out of CFG's ability to provide a wealth of industry expertise and resources to the rapidly developing Chinese football industry," CFG, CMC and CITIC said in a joint statement. "The capital from the share acquisition will be used by City Football Group to fund its China growth, further CFG international business expansion opportunities and further develop CFG infrastructure assets."

As well as Manchester City, the current Premier League leaders, CFG also owns New York City FC and Melbourne City FC and is a minority shareholder in Japanese club Yokohama F Marinos. The deal, which values CFG at around \$3 billion, is still subject to regulatory approval. It comes after Xi was given a tour of Manchester City, twice Premier League champions in recent years, during a state visit to Britain in October. British chancellor George Osborne had previously announced a £3 million (\$4.5 million) investment package for grassroots football in China. Earlier this year, Xi released a 50point plan to turn the country into a "football pow-

erhouse", including proposals to set up 50,000 foot-

ball schools across the country. The Premier League is hugely popular in China and David Beckham, one of its foremost icons, has been a global ambassador for Chinese football since March 2013. The list of owners of Premier League clubs includes investors from Russia. Thailand and the United States, but China has never previously made such a significant investment in one of the division's superpowers.

"Football is the most loved, played and watched sport in the world and in China, the exponential growth pathway for the game is both unique and hugely exciting," said CFG chairman Khaldoon Al Mubarak. "We have therefore worked hard to find the right partners and to create the right deal structure to leverage the incredible potential that exists in China, both for CFG and for football at large." CMC chairman Li Ruigang will join the CFG board, becoming its seventh member. "We and our consortium partner CITIC Capital ... see this investment as a prime opportunity for furthering the contribution of China to the global football family," Li said.

Prior to Tuesday's announcement, the ADUG, an investment arm of the Abu Dhabi royal family, was the CFG's sole shareholder. The ADUG was formed in 2008 when Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al Nahyan completed the purchase of City from former Thailand prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra. It made City, who have spent much of their existence in the shadow of cross-town rivals Manchester United, one of the world's richest clubs. Investment in players, coaching staff and new facilities has led to notable on-pitch success, including Premier League triumphs in 2012 and 2014, an FA Cup success in 2011 and League Cup victory in 2014. — AFP

IMF APPROVES YUAN AS ELITE RESERVE CURRENCY

Renminbi to enter in Oct 2016 with 10.92% share

WASHINGTON: The International Monetary Fund welcomed China's yuan into its elite reserve currency basket Monday, recognizing the ascendance of the Asian power in the global economy.

The yuan, also known as the renminbi, will join the US dollar, euro, Japanese yen and British pound next year in the basket of currencies the IMF uses as an international reserve asset. IMF Managing Director Christine Lagarde called the decision "an important milestone in the integration of the Chinese economy into the global financial system." "It is also a recognition of the progress that the Chinese authorities have made in the past years in reforming China's monetary and financial systems," she added. The decision by the IMF executive board solidifies China's ambition to see the government-controlled yuan achieve global status as one of the world's top currencies alongside the United States, Europe and Japan.

ited States, Europe and Japan. China, the world's second-largest economy, asked last year for the yuan to be added to the Fund's Special Drawing Rights basket. But, while already meeting the SDR criteria for being widely used, as recently as August the Fund considered the currency too tightly controlled

However, IMF staff experts in early November said that Beijing had taken the steps necessary for the yuan to be called "freely usable", opening the way for Monday's decision. Lagarde said the yuan's inclusion in the bas-

ket was expected to help China open up further to the world economy. "The continuation and deepening of these efforts will bring about a more robust international monetary and financial system, which in turn will support the growth and stability of China and the global economy," she said.

The unexpected devaluation of the yuan last August received good marks from the IMF as it expanded the currency's movements based on market forces.

In addition, Beijing announced last week that an initial group of foreign central banks has been allowed to enter the Chinese currency market, which likely will promote further internationalization of the yuan in global trading. IMF members can use the Special Drawing Rights basket to obtain currencies to meet balance-of-payments needs. The Fund also issues its crisis loans-crucial to struggling economies like Greece-valued in SDRs. The yuan's entry into the basket takes effect on October 1, 2016.

Chinese challenges

China's central bank welcomed the decision. "The joining of RMB in the SDR basket also means the international community has greater expectations on China to play an active role in the world economic and financial arena," it said in a statement carried by the official

Xinhua news agency.

It puts the Bank of China under pressure to provide more transparency in line with its

peers, such as the Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank. "If part of their policy is to gradually liberalize the capital account and the financial sector, this is setting in motion a process of opening up that cannot be reversed," Angel Udibe, a financial markets expert at the Peterson Institute for International Economics, told AFP.

"It really make the case at home that they need to continue with the process of liberalization." The composition and weightings of the SDRs basket are reviewed every five years. The last time the currencies in the basket were changed was in 2000, when the euro replaced the German deutsche mark and the French franc. The value of the SDR is based on a weighted average of the currencies in the basket. With the inclusion of the yuan, the dollar's weight in the new basket will be little changed from its current 41.7 percent. The euro will be 30.9 percent, the yuan 10.9 percent, the yen 8.3 percent, and the pound 8.1 percent.

The inclusion of the yuan came with the support of the United States, the IMF's largest shareholder. Until recently Washington accused China of keeping the yuan artificially low to gain a trade advantage. But in October the US Treasury Department softened its tone, saying that after Beijing's moves to loosen controls, the yuan "remains below its appropriate mediumterm valuation."

Still, the IMF decision risks angering some lawmakers in the US Congress amid fierce maneuvering for the 2016 presidential election. "With this decision, the IMF is choosing to reward China's currency manipulation instead of combating it," said Senator Chuck Schumer, a New York Democrat and longtime China critic. "This decision is an affront to the millions of US workers who have lost their jobs at the hands of China's rapacious trading practices, and sends a terrible signal to the rest of the world that currency manipulation is acceptable behavior in the eyes of the IMF."—AFP

OPTIMISM OVER IRAN HELPS DUBAI OUTPERFORM REGION

DUBAI: As low oil prices cast a shadow over Gulf Arab economies, investors are betting that lifting sanctions on Iran will boost Dubai - a view that is causing the emirate's debt to outperform the rest of the region. The outperformance may be surprising to some investors. Dubai recovered only in the last few years from a 2009 debt crisis, and as a trade and business centre for the Gulf, it will not escape a regional slowdown caused by cheap oil.

Dubai real estate prices are falling and its equities index is down 41 percent from last year's peak. But bond prices and credit default swaps, used to insure against the risk of a sovereign default, have barely moved in Dubai, even though cheap oil has dampened investor sentiment toward the rest of the region.

The spread of a May 2022 US dollar sovereign sukuk from Dubai over an April 2019 sovereign bond from Abu Dhabi narrowed to 1.83 percent yesterday from 1.97 percent at the start of this year. Five-year Dubai CDS are down 65 points from the end of last year to 210 points, according to Markit data. The CDS of most sovereigns in the six-nation Gulf Cooperation Council are lower in absolute terms, but all of the region's CDS except Dubai have risen this year.

A major reason is expectations that Dubai will quickly reclaim its traditional status as a hub for trade with and investment in Iran after international economic sanctions, imposed over Tehran's nuclear plans, are lifted early next year.

"Lifting sanctions against Iran is a point that Dubai will benefit most from. Dubai has a strong history of close trade interaction with Iran and should be the key beneficiary among all GCC credits when Iran opens its market - this is what CDS are pointing to," said Sergey Dergachev, senior portfolio manager for emerging market debt at Union Investment Privatfonds in Germany.

RISKS

One factor bolstering confidence in Dubai is that its economy, which is strong in areas from finance and real estate to trade and tourism, is much more diversified than the rest of the Gulf. Oil and gas output accounts for an almost negligible fraction of Dubai's gross domestic product; for other Gulf states, it is around a third or more.

"Dubai is an outlier and not really that impacted by the oil price slump - Dubai would be more hammered by a global growth and trade slowdown, and here the situation still looks not bad," Dergachev said.

However, the composition of Dubai's GDP understates the extent to which it is vulnerable to an oil-related slump in the region.

Tourism-related industries account for 20 percent or more of the economy, and roughly a fifth of international visitors to Dubai come from the GCC. Around a fifth of real estate purchases are estimated to be by GCC buyers from outside Dubai. Meanwhile, market interest rates in the

United Arab Emirates have started rising as less oil money flows through the banking system, and the start of US monetary tightening as early

as this month could boost rates further.

This, combined with a regional economic slowdown, could make it harder for Dubai and its government-related enterprises (GREs) to finance the \$143 billion debt overhang left over from their financial crisis. "Imprudent risk-taking and re-leveraging by Dubai GREs and private companies could prop up short-term growth at the expense of medium-term stability," the International Monetary Fund warned in a report in August.

But for many investors, the prospect of an Iran-related boom at least partly outweighs that risk. The IMF estimated that removing sanctions on Iran could add 1 percentage point to the UAE's GDP growth between 2016 and 2018, simply by boosting non-hydrocarbon exports. Dubai, with its sophisticated trading infrastructure, could grab most of that benefit.

The emirate would also profit from increased Iranian demand for services exports such as trade finance, transport, tourism and hospitality. The number of Dubai hotel guests arriving from Iran has almost halved since 2010; it could now recover

"If sanctions are lifted, the additional indirect impact of spending by tourists and business travellers in the broader economy could be significant," the IMF said.—Reuters

US FACTORY ACTIVITY DROPS IN NOVEMBER

WASHINGTON: US factory activity fell last month to the lowest level in more than six years, with a stronger dollar and low oil prices cutting new orders and hurting pro-

The Institute for Supply Management said yesterday that its index of factory activity in November dropped to 48.6 from 50.1 in October. Any reading below 50 signals contraction and the index has tumbled below that critical level for the first time since November 2012.

It now rests at its lowest level since June 2009, a worrisome sign as Federal Reserve officials will consider raising short-term interest rates this month on the understanding that the economy has sufficiently healed from the Great Recession. US manufacturers hit a rut in 2015. A global economic slowdown and a rising dollar have crimped exports, while lower oil prices have led energy firms to slash their orders for steel pipe and other equipment for drilling. Those pressures have steadily curbed growth in factory activity this year and have now pushed the manufacturing sector into contraction.

A measure for new orders dropped to 48.9 from 52.9, while production fell to 49.2 from 52.9. Still, the report showed a rebound in hiring as its employment measure improved to 51.3 from 47.6 a month earlier. US manufacturers have been squeezed this year as a strong dollar and weak economies in China and other key

foreign markets have cut into exports

The dollar has appreciated nearly 14 percent against a grouping of major currencies from a year ago. The increase has left manufacturers at a disadvantage. U.S. goods have become more expensive overseas, while lowering prices for imported goods that compete against American products. China has been stuck in a slowdown, as has Brazil. Europe - a major trade partner - remains economically fragile, while Canada and Japan have sunk into recession.

Companies trimmed their stockpiles of goods between July and September, the government said last week. That cut economic growth during those three months at an annualized rate of 0.6 percentage points, even though overall growth advanced 2.1 percent.

Despite the dismal outlook from the ISM report, there is evidence that some manufacturers are adjusting to these challenging conditions.

The Fed reported that US manufacturing output rose in October for the first time in three months as steel mills, auto plants and computer factories became busier. For the third consecutive quarter, US CEOs expressed growing caution about the country's economic prospects in the short term and more said they expected to curtail capital investments over the next six months, according to a survey released yesterday.— Agencies



OPEC RISKS PYRRHIC VICTORY WITH OIL POLICY: ANALYST

LONDON: "If we are victorious in one more battle with the Romans, we shall be utterly ruined," King Pyrrhus of Epirus complained after winning exceptionally bloody engagements in 280

Pyrrhus lost many of his men, most of his generals and had no reserves left, while "the army of the Romans, as if from a fountain gushing forth indoors, was easily and speedily filled up again" according to Plutarch. The king of Epirus, reported to have been a brilliant general, has come to symbolise victories that are so expensive they leave the victor dangerously weakened.

Pyrrhus won the battle but lost the war. As ministers from the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries meet in Vienna, some may wonder if the strategy of maintaining output to defend market share risks securing a Pyrrhic victory.

OPEC has put shale producers on the defensive and forced the cancellation of many ambitious oil projects with its strategy of going for volume over price. But members are gradually running out of money and the shale industry is waiting for any upturn in prices to start ramping up production again.

Meanwhile Iran is set to boost its oil exports once sanctions lifted, which will make the supply glut worse, and the risks of recession in developed and developing countries alike are increasing. Some OPEC members, led by Saudi Arabia, remain hopeful that they will secure an eventual victory. The question is whether all the short-term pain will be worth it in the longer run.

MIXED RESULTS

In November 2014, OPEC ministers decided to maintain their production unchanged even though oil prices had already fallen \$40 per barrel, 37 percent, over the previous five months.

In choosing this course, which was led by Saudi Arabia but endorsed by other members, ministers expressed concern about the increase in non-OPEC supply and the continued rise in both developed and developing country stocks. Twelve months later, oil consumption is growing at some of the fastest rates in over a decade, US shale production has peaked for the time being and non-OPEC oil output is forecast to decline in 2016.

But Russian oil production is the highest on record and oil inventories in developed countries have risen by 250 million barrels, almost 6 percent, with millions more extra barrels in storage in emerging markets. SAUDI STRATEGY

OPEC's production strategy has been driven by Saudi Arabia, the cartel's biggest producer, and its veteran oil minister Ali laimi, who has made clear the kingdom felt it had little choice.

Four years with prices averaging at or above \$100 per barrel had left the market on an unsustainable course, with supply growth accelerating, especially from shale, while demand growth was slowing. Oil prices had to fall substantially to curb growth in high-cost production from shale and other sources while encouraging faster growth in demand. If Saudi Arabia had cut its output to prop up prices, it would simply have encouraged more growth in shale and demands for even deeper cutbacks later. Saudi Arabia would have been left with the worst of both worlds: lower prices and lower production. The strategy had been tried before in the early 1980s and ended in comprehensive failure.

MORE TIME

Commentators close to Saudi Arabia insist policymakers always understood the rebalancing process would take several years. But prices have fallen much further and for much longer than senior Saudi policymakers believed was likely in 2014.

The gains from the strategy have been modest so far which has led to mounting questions about whether it is working or should be changed. Global oil inventories are still rising by more than 1 million barrels per day. While shale and non-OPEC output more generally has started to fall, strong output from Saudi Arabia and Russia has kept the market oversupplied.

Consumption has grown by between 1.5 million and 2.0 million barrels per day in 2015, partly thanks to lower fuel prices, but there are doubts about whether the pace of growth can be maintained in 2016. Iran is poised to add an extra 0.5 million to 1.0 million barrels per day to the oil market once sanctions are lifted.

In developing countries, which have accounted for all the ncrease in fuel demand since 2005, economic growth is slowing as a result of the collapse in commodity prices and the prospect of higher US interest rates.

And in the advanced economies, the economic expansion is

relatively mature and there is an increasing risk of another recession arriving within the next 2-3 years, which would cut oil demand.

FINE TUNING

Given continued oversupply in the oil market and the big build-up of inventories, most analysts do not see the market rebalancing before 2017 or even 2018. But by the start of 2017, the U.S. expansion will be 90 months old, making it longer than all but three expansions on record, according to the National Bureau of Economic Research.

By the end of 2018, the US expansion will be 114 months old, longer than every other expansion except the expansion which began in March 1991.

If the strategy is to balance the oil market by 2017 or 2018, it will rebalance just as the US economy is poised for another downturn. In the meantime, oil-producing countries are burning through their financial reserves at an unsustainable rate according to the IMF.

Saudi Arabia's external reserves have fallen from a peak of \$737 billion in July 2014 to \$654 billion in September 2015. Other members of OPEC have smaller much financial buffers and will run out much sooner. Nearly all members of OPEC will exhaust their reserves in less than five years, according to the IMF, though in some cases it may be possible to extend the reserves by issuing foreign currency debt instead.

Saudi officials have been briefing journalists and analysts that prices are too low and need to rise to \$60-80 per barrel in the medium term to encourage enough investment to meet demand. The attempt to guide market expectations higher has not been backed up by any formal change in output policy ("Saudi counters lower for longer oil mantra" Financial Times, Nov 26). For the time being, there appears to be enough political support in Saudi Arabia and its key allies around the Gulf to give the strategy more time. But that patience will not last forever.

If the strategy does not show clear signs of working and prices are not higher by this time next year, the political pressure to change course will be overwhelming. For now, the Saudis and OPEC appear committed to their current course, and a formal policy change appears unlikely. But there is scope for some flexibility in production at the margin without formally changing policy, which could limit the build-up of stocks and in turn buy the strategy more time. —Reuters

Aramco wants 70% of \$300bn supply chain spend to be local

DUBAI/KHOBAR: Saudi Aramco wants to double to 70 percent the amount of goods and services it sources from the local market by 2021 as the kingdom's oil giant outlined plans to spend \$300 billion on its supply chain in the next 10 years, its chief executive said. The local sourcing target comes at a time of significant financial stress in Saudi Arabia, as the Gulf's largest economy adjusts to a projected period of sustained lower oil prices and subsequent reduced state spending and economic growth. As part of its local focus for the supply chain, Aramco aims to create around 500,000 direct and indirect jobs for Saudi nationals, Amin Nasser said, according to the text of a speech given yesterday and published on Aramco's website.

OPEC oil price at \$38.93pb

VIENNA: The OPEC daily basket price went down 15 cents Monday and stood at \$38.93 per barrel compared with \$39.08 pb the previous day, the cartel said yesterday. The yearly average of the OPEC's basket price hit \$96.29 a barrel, it added. The new OPEC Reference Basket of Crudes (ORB) is made up of the following: Saharan Blend (Algeria), Girassol (Angola), Oriente (Ecuador), Iran Heavy (Islamic Republic of Iran), Basra Light (Iraq), Kuwait Export (Kuwait), Es Sider (Libya), Bonny Light (Nigeria), Qatar Marine (Qatar), Arab Light (Saudi Arabia), Murban (UAE) and Merey (Venezuela). During their annual meeting in June, the OPEC oil ministers agreed to maintain their output ceiling of 30 million barrels per day. The OPEC expects high demand for oil and high supply on the part of non-OPEC member states in the second half of 2015.

US dollar firm vis-a-vis Kuwaiti dinar at 0.304

KUWAIT: The US dollar stabilized vis-a-vis the Kuwaiti dinar yesterday trading at KD 0.304 whereas the euro plunged to KD 0.321, as compared to Monday's rates, the Central Bank of Kuwait said. The Sterling Pound dropped to KD 0.459, Swiss franc rose to KD 0.296 while the Japanese yen firmed at KD 0.002.

Qatar launches \$5.5bn, 5-yr loan into syndication

DUBAI: The government of Qatar has invited banks to participate in a \$5.5 billion sovereign loan, sources aware of the matter said yesterday, as it becomes the latest Gulf state to raise funds at a time of stretched state finances due to lower oil prices. The loan is smaller than the up-to-\$10 billion which the government was said by sources last month to be seeking. The transaction is being arranged by Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ, Mizuho, Sumitomo Mitsui Banking Corp, Deutsche Bank, Barclays and Qatar National Bank, two of the sources said, speaking on condition of anonymity as the information isn't public. The interest rate on the loan will be between 85 and 95 basis points over the London interbank offered rate (Libor). according to a third source with direct knowledge of the deal. Marketing of the deal will close in the third week of December, the two sources said.

Vodafone Qatar appoints Ian Gray as CEO

DUBAI: Vodafone Qatar has appointed Ian Gray as

chief executive officer with immediate effect, the loss-making Vodafone affiliate said yesterday. He replaces outgoing CEO Kyle Whitehill, who will leave Vodafone to pursue other opportunities, a company statement said. Gray joins from Vodafone Egypt, where he was chairman. Whitehill joined Vodafone Qatar as CEO in June 2013, having worked for the Vodafone group since 2001. Vodafone Qatar has yet to make a quarterly net profit since ending statecontrolled Ooredoo's domestic monopoly in 2009. Its losses had been consistently diminishing, but that trajectory has faltered of late, reporting widening year-on-year losses for the past four quarters.

OPEC NOVEMBER OUTPUT RISES, LED BY IRAQ, SAUDI, SAYS SURVEY

OUTPUT RISES BY 250,000 BPD TO 31.77 MILLION BPD

VIENNA: OPEC oil output has risen in November from the previous month, a Reuters survey found on Monday, led by a rebound in Iraqi exports after bad weather had temporarily halted supply growth from the group's second-largest producer. The increase indicates the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries is again pumping close to a record high as Saudi Arabia and other big producers focus on market share. OPEC meets this week to review the policy, with no change expected.

OPEC supply has risen in November to 31.77 million barrels per day (bpd) from 31.64 million in October, according to the survey, based on shipping data and information from sources at oil companies, OPEC and consultants.

The OPEC meeting on Friday comes almost a year after its historic decision, led by Saudi Arabia, to refuse to prop up prices. Oil has more than halved in 18 months due to persistent oversupply, but even those in OPEC who want a change in approach do not expect one.

"I am seeing that Saudi Arabia will not change its position," said an OPEC delegate from a non-Gulf country which favors supply restraint. "No favorable outcome will be reached at the next meeting." OPEC has boosted production by about 1.50 million bpd since its November 2014 policy shift. Output is not far below July's 31.88 million bpd, the highest since Reuters records began in

The biggest monthly rise in output has come from Iraq, the world's fastest growing source of supply growth this year. Exports from Irag's main outlet, its southern terminals, have risen in November to at least 3.06 million bpd and could top that and set a record high if tankers currently waiting depart before

INDIA'S CB KEEPS KEY INTEREST RATES ON HOLD

MUMBAI: India's central bank kept interest rates on hold yesterday, citing rising inflation and "weakness" in Asia's third-largest economy

despite recent growth. The move follows recent rate cuts designed to lower the cost of investing and boost India's economy, a key priority for Prime Minister

Narendra Modi. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said the benchmark repo rate, the level at which it lends to commercial banks, would remain at 6.75 percent as analysts had expected. "Indicators suggest the economy is in the early stages of a recovery, though with some areas of continued weakness," RBI Governor Raghuram Rajan said in a statement following the bank's monetary policy review meeting in Mumbai.

"The uptick of CPI inflation excluding food and fuel for two months in succession warrants vigilance," he added. Rajan has made controlling inflation a priority, setting a target of bringing it consistently below six percent by January 2016 and to four percent for the 2016/17 financial year. India's consumer prices rose five percent in October, below the target, but accelerating from a 4.41 percent increase in September. "Inflation has turned up as anticipated, and is expected to rise further until December before plateauing," Rajan said in the statement.

A survey of 47 economists by Bloomberg had overwhelmingly predicted Rajan would hold rates after he surprised analysts in September with an aggressive 50-basis-point reduction, suggesting there would be little room for further easing in 2015.

The bank chief has already lopped 125 basis points off borrowing rates this calendar year in four separate cuts to bring the repo rate down to its lowest level in four years. Economic

growth has notched 7.4 percent year-on-year in the second quarter, outperforming China, data showed Monday.

More growth needed?

Modi has focused on spurring economic growth since sweeping to power in a general election in May 2014 and India has now posted three straight quarters of growth above seven percent. But investors have raised concerns about the pace of promised economic reform needed to create jobs for India's tens of millions of young people. They are hoping Modi's government will be able to reach an agreement with opposition parties and push reforms through the current session of parliament, including one that paves the way for a longawaited national sales tax.

Rajan also cited "weak" global growth and a flagging Chinese economy as reasons to remain

Analyst Arun Singh said the RBI had also chosen to wait to see whether the US Federal Reserve would hike rates later this month, as expected, before cutting again.

"It makes sense to stick with the status quo until we get clarity," the senior economist at Dun & Bradstreet, told AFP. After the RBI cut rates in January and March, it kept them unchanged in April, citing inflation concerns and a failure of most commercial banks to pass on lower loan rates to customers. In June it snipped off a further 25 basis points before holding rates at its meeting in August and then slashed the repo rate the next month to its lowest level since March 2011. It is still much higher than compared to other major economies, with the United States and Japan at record lows of near zero percent. —AFP

QATARI BANK CBQ EYES SALE OF UAB STAKE

DUBAI: Commercial Bank of Qatar (CBQ) has been trying to sell its 40 percent stake in troubled Emirati lender United Arab Bank, but is yet to find a buyer, sources aware of the matter told Reuters.

The Sharjah-based lender has had a difficult few months, with its chief executive leaving after the bank swung to a third-quarter loss on significant provisioning for soured loans. Such a position, combined with expectations of further challenges for UAE banks as the economy slows and loan defaults increase, would make concluding any deal extremely tricky, according to the sources who spoke on condition of anonymity as the information isn't public. The stake has a value of around 3 billion dirhams (\$817 million) based on current market capitalization, according to Thomson

Reuters data. CBQ declined to comment. It was unclear how far talks had progressed with any of the parties contacted by CBQ, which included local banks. But given market conditions, the sources noted a sales process was unlikely to go far. A Doha-based banker said any potential buyer would demand CBQ offer to indemnify them against future losses

incurred by UAB. The UAE's seventh-largest bank by market value, UAB has stopped lending to some of its small and medium-sized enterprise customers as it seeks to protect itself from further damage after a net loss of 272.6 million dirhams in the third quarter, three separate sources said. —Reuters

ECB MAY SURPRISE WITH SIZE OF NEW STIMULUS

Draghi signals action on interest rate possible

FRANKFURT: Christmas is coming and some investors are already convinced they will unwrap an early present tomorrow in the form of more economic stimulus from the European Central Bank.

ECB head Mario Draghi has signaled clearly that action is coming this week when the bank's governing council meets. So clearly, in fact, that the challenge - as for parents with overexcited children may be simply to avoid disappointing expectations. That means that this week's meeting could bring surprises. Draghi may seek to exceed expectations by expanding its bond-buying stimulus program or cutting interest rate more than ana-

Bond purchases tend to drive up the price of a broad range of other assets, including stocks. Another consequence could be a weaker euro against the dollar. Some think the euro, which is currently around \$1.06, could head down toward \$1.00, so-called parity. Others say Draghi may have to exceed expectations just to keep it where it is.

The weaker euro against the dollar would mean cheaper European travel for Americans. But it could also hurt the profits of American companies doing business in Europe, because the currency shift will shrink euro earnings in dollar terms. More broadly, a weaker euro would help eurozone exporters by making their goods more competitive in major trade partners including China, the US, Britain and Japan. Starting from the ECB's Oct. 22 meeting and in subsequent speeches, Draghi has indicated action is likely in December. Through its stimulus actions, ECB aims to make credit cheaper for companies to support growth, which is still weak at just 0.3 percent in the third quarter. Most of all, it is trying to push inflation higher from 0.1 percent toward its goal

of just under 2 percent annually. Price stability is the bank's chief goal; low inflation suggests the economy is weak and makes it harder for indebted countries such as Greece to recover.

To achieve that, the ECB is currently buying 60 billion euros in government and corporate bonds a month, up to a total of 1.1 trillion euros. And Draghi mentioned that the current rate on funds deposited

A cut in the deposit rate has several effects that could help stimulate the economy. It would increase the amount of safe bonds available for the ECB to buy, since currently the central bank cannot purchase bonds yielding less than its deposit rate. It would push banks to lend money instead of hoarding it at the ECB. Perhaps most important of all, the negative deposit rate is seen as tied to the euro's exchange rate to the dollar. That is because the lower rates go in the eurozone, the less people want euros to buy fixed income investments. That lessens demand for euros - and sends its exchange rate lower. It helps exporters and helps the ECB raise inflation by making imports more expensive.

And that's particularly so against the dollar, since the US Federal Reserve is widely expected to make its first rate increase in years at a Dec. 15-16 meeting. —AP

QATAR RECOVERS FROM MSCI SHOCK; EGYPT REBOUNDS

DUBAI: Several major Middle Eastern stock markets

rose yesterday, led by Qatar, which recovered steep losses triggered the previous day by MSCI's rebalancing of its emerging markets index.

Qatar's stock index tumbled 4.4 percent on Monday as MSCI added overseas-listed Chinese companies to its index, diluting Qatar's weighting and causing an outflow of passive funds. The drop in the Qatari market was magnified by thin turnover and a lack of buying interest. Yetserday, Qatar rebounded 4.4 percent. Gulf International Services, the second most active stock on Doha's exchange, surged 10 percent after plunging 9.4 percent on Monday as it was deleted from the MSCI emerging market index

Qatar Gas Transport, the most heavily traded stock, fell 2.9 percent after climbing 1.3 percent on Monday as it was added to the index. Some other blue chips jumped, with Islamic bank Masraf Al Rayan up 6.2 percent. "Yesterday's sharp fall of the market was a one-off event, largely magnified by lack of buying interest," said a portfolio manager based in Doha. Local and regional investors were buying on Tuesday, he added.

The Saudi stock index rose 0.7 percent in the heaviest trade so far this week as miner Ma'aden added 2.6 percent. Emaar Economic City climbed 4.3 percent to a five-week high. It has attracted interest since it said on Sunday last week that authorities, who have been investigating how the firm acquired land in the industrial zone it is developing, would let it keep the land to protect the interests of investors.

PetroRabigh fell 1.6 percent after saying that its high olefin cracker unit and its subordinate units would remain offline until Dec. 30, although it would restart most operations at its refining and petrochemical complex on Thursday after a 50-day planned maintenance period.

Egypt's index climbed 1.1 percent to 6,425 points, bouncing from near technical support on the November low of 6,302 points. Locals were net buyers of stocks while foreigners continued to sell,

according to exchange data. Uncertainty continued to rein about foreign exchange policy. The central bank held the Egyptian

pound steady at 7.7301 to the US dollar in a regular foreign exchange auction that caused confusion because some bankers said they were denied dollars. Later, the central bank said it had revised the way it allocated foreign currency at auction, but gave few details.

After the market closed, it said it had repaid foreign investors in stocks and securities a total of \$546 million, clearing a backlog that had built up amid a dollar shortage.

Global Telecom Holding was the top performing Egyptian stock, surging 10 percent to 1.76 Egyptian pounds, after the company announced on Monday that it would combine its Pakistan telecommunications business with local mobile operator Warid Telecom. This confirmed a statement by foreign partner Vimpelcom at the end of last week.

Naeem brokerage said this would be positive for the stock and kept a "buy" recommendation, with a target price of 4.00 pounds. Qalaa Holdings jumped 4.5 percent after saying its Gozour agrifoods unit had signed deals to sell assets in Sudan and Egypt for about \$11 million, as Qalaa continued to sell non-core assets. The Dubai and Abu Dhabi markets were closed for National Day holidays. —Reuters

STOCKS STUTTER, EURO FIRMS AS ECB BETS WAVER

LONDON: European stock markets stuttered and the euro clawed back some ground against the US dollar yesterday as investors had second thoughts about sky-high expectations of European Central Bank easing this week.

Britain's FTSE 100 was one of only a couple of the region's bourses to show gains after the release of promising bank stress tests, with record low unemployment data from Germany feeding fears that ECB stimulus hopes could be overdone. US stocks were set to open up 0.3 percent, building on Asian gains after tentative signs that a slowdown in China was stabilising.

Europe's bond yields ticked higher and the single currency bounced off a 7-1/2-month low on concerns that the ECB may not deliver all the stimulus on Thursday that investors have come to expect.

Markets are already pricing in a deposit rate cut and an increase in the size, scope and lenath of the ECB's trillion-euro bond buying program. Analysts say it would be hard for ECB President Mario Draghi to surprise markets.

"The big question is if Draghi can surprise the markets, given that ECB by its own comments has contributed to quite stretched market expectations," SEB head of fixed income research, Jussi Hiljanen, said. The FTSEurofirst 300 was up slightly on the day, with the rally in the FTSE offsetting falls in Germany's DAX and France's CAC 40.

European stocks failed to gain much sustained impetus from Chinese data which sent MSCI's broadest index of Asia-Pacific shares outside Japan up 1.8 percent. China's official Purchasing Managers' Index reached a threeyear low in November. But the private Caixin/Markit China Manufacturing PMI showed factory activity contracted at a slower

pace than in October, fuelling hopes the economy may have been bolstered by government support.

In Europe's largest economy, Germany, there were further signs of a turnaround in fortunes, with unemployment dropping to the lowest level since reunification in

CMC Markets' Michael Hewson said that these sorts of signs of life in the euro zone economy could limit the aggressiveness of ECB stimulus. "Quite simply there is a risk that market expectations of what the ECB will do this week are based on the premise of shock and awe, when in reality they could get something more akin to bubble and squeak," he said in a note to clients. This was certainly the feeling among bond and currency investors, with German yields up for the second straight day, coming off a one-month low hit on Friday, and the euro rising to \$1.0593, after dropping to a 7-1/2-month low of \$1.0557 on Monday.

China's yuan was flat in onshore trading, after the International Monetary Fund on Monday admitted the yuan into its Special Drawing Rights (SDR) basket alongside the dollar, euro, pound sterling

The widely expected move was a mile-

stone in China's integration into global finances and a nod of approval to the country's reforms. The dollar index, which tracks the greenback against a basket of six major rival currencies, edged down to 100.00. That still left it within sight of the 100.39 the index hit in March, its highest for more than 12 years, on expectations Federal Reserve will raise US interest rates later this month. By contrast, the Reserve Bank of Australia held rates steady at 2 percent at its policy meeting. The Australian dollar rose about 0.7 percent after the decision, to \$0.7277.

Australian shares rallied 1.9 percent, extending gains, after trade data showed Australia's economy gained last quarter from a rebound in resource exports. US crude oil prices regained some ground after volatile trading overnight, when they first rallied and then erased gains after a survey estimated higher OPEC output. GOLD RISES 1% AS DOLLAR RETREATS PRIOR TO ECB

LONDON: Gold rose for a second day yesterday, rebounding from last week's 5-1/2 year low, as a retreat in the dollar prompted investors to cover short positions ahead of a European Central Bank meeting and US payrolls data this week.

The dollar slid from an 8-1/2month high as the euro bounced back, with traders judging that a significant amount of further monetary easing had already been priced into the single currency ahead of Thursday's ECB meeting. Spot gold was up 0.5 percent at \$1,069.00 an ounce at 1023 GMT, while US gold futures for February delivery were up \$2.90 an ounce at \$1,068.20. The metal hit its lowest since February 2010 last week at \$1,064.46.

Gold posted its biggest monthly drop in 2-1/2 years in November, falling 7 percent as investors positioned for a US rate hike this month. Rising rates are expected to increase the opportunity cost of holding nonyielding bullion, while boosting the dollar. Data from the US Commodity **Futures Trading Commission showed** on Monday that hedge funds and money managers added to their net short position in COMEX gold con- an ounce, while platinum was up 0.6 tracts in the week to Nov. 24. That has led some to judge that shorts have become over-extended.

"I can give you the first 14,655 reasons for the bounce- that's the record short position that was reached last Tuesday," Saxo Bank's head of commodities research Ole Hansen said. "A rate hike is fully priced in and... the failure to extend the sell-off after reaching a five-year low has triggered this reaction," he said.

In the physical markets, there were signs of robust demand. The US Mint's sales of American Eagle coins rebounded in November from the previous month's slump. Premiums on the Shanghai Gold Exchange, an indicator of buying strength at top consumer China, were at a healthy \$5-\$6 an ounce.

"Gold has the potential for further short covering to take prices higher, especially if emerging market physical demand stays strong," HSBC said in a note. "But investors will look to two events this week that may influence bullion." "The ECB rate announcement on Thursday 3 December could impact the EUR if the bank further loosens policy ... (while) gold could weaken if the jobs figure is significantly above mean expectations."

Silver was up 0.6 percent at \$14.17 percent at \$835.74 an ounce and palladium was up 0.3 percent at \$546.50 an ounce. — Reuters

GERMAN POWER GIANT RWE TO SPIN OFF RENEWABLES BUSINESS

FRANKFURT: German power giant RWE, hit hard by government plans to phase out nuclear power and fossil fuels, announced plans vesterday to spin off its renewables, grids and retail operations and take the unit public. Bigger rival E.ON is similarly splitting its conventional and renewable energies operations into separate entities.

The aim was to "create a platform for growth with its own access to the capital market. This will strengthen the viability of the group as a whole. The new subsidiary will be listed on the stock market probably in late 2016," RWE said in a statement.

The move was "in response to the transformation of the European energy landscape," said chief executive Peter Terium. Germany's power suppliers have been hit in recent years by government plans to eliminate nuclear power by the next decade and champion a so-called "energy transition" away from fossil fuels such as coal towards renewable energy sources such as the wind and the sun.

Power utilities have complained that the cost of having to close down their nuclear power plants and the heavy subsidies afforded to renewable energy have pushed them deeply into the red.

"We are creating two viable companies under one roof. The new subsidiary will have its own access to the capital market and improve our growth prospects," RWE's CEO explained. "At the same time, we are convinced that conventional power generation will remain an irreplaceable partner for renewable energy for decades to come. Our conventional power stations are the backup for renewables."

Investors appeared to like the idea and RWE shares were the biggest gainers on the Frankfurt stock exchange, soaring by around 9.5 percent in mid-afternoon trading.

RWE retains majority stake

RWE said it planned to offer some 10 percent of the new unit's share capital to the public. "At the same or later point in time additional stakes may be disposed. The proceeds will be used to finance further growth in markets with good future prospects," the statement said. "RWE will remain the new company's majority shareholder over the long term and consolidate it fully. The parent company will focus on conventional power generation and energy trading," it

added. RWE said that based on the proforma figures for 2015, the new company would achieve external revenue of more than 40 billion euros (\$42 billion) and underlying profit of over four billion euros. The company, which like RWE would continue to be based in Essen, would employ approximately 40,000 of the RWE group's nearly 60,000-strong workforce, it said.

RWE said that the decision to focus on conventional power generation and trading at the parent company would make "a substantial contribution to the security and flexibility of the entire energy market."

"The new company will be an attractive dividend stock and also reinforce RWE AG's financial strength," said CEO Terium. "The capital increase will boost our investment capacity. I am extremely confident that our clear focus on our future-oriented business fields and the additional investment capital will enable us to create added value for the group as a whole. The IPO is therefore in the interest of all our stakeholders," Terium said. — AFP

SOUTH KOREA NOV **EXPORTS FALL LESS** THAN EXPECTED

SEOUL: South Korean exports fell for an 11th straight month in November, while foreign orders shrank at a sharper pace, pointing to a further deterioration in global demand and prompting some analysts to call for more interest rate cuts. November export data and a private manufacturing survey highlighted persistent downward pressure on Asia's fourth-largest economy from weak external demand, with factory activity shrinking for the ninth straight month.

But the activity survey, combined with other data in recent weeks, also suggested that the weak trade outlook was being offset in part by a recovery in domestic consumption, which could make policymakers more cautious about further easing. Exports fell 4.7 percent on-year in November, less than an 8.3 percent fall forecast in a Reuters poll, government data showed. But several analysts noted the decline would have been much worse if not for big ship deliveries. "Headline exports without vessels would have fallen 12 percent," said Wai Ho Leong, an economist at Barclays. "The broader trend remains unchanged - marked by high inventories, slower inventory clearance and a lack

The trade ministry said export prospects remain bleak as China and other emerging economies were still slowing and Europe as a whole was struggling to regain economic momentum. Minutes released late yesterday from the last Bank of Korea meeting on Nov. 12 showed some members of the policy board were more doubtful of the economic recovery than Governor Lee Ju-yeol, who has recently seemed reluctant to cut rates again.

"Weakness in exports will persist for a while and I feel downside risks to growth have increased," said one member in the anonymous minutes. Exports to the European Union soared 52.5 percent in November on-year but mainly due to increased sales of ships. Exports to China, South Korea's biggest trade partner, fell by 6.8 percent, in their fifth straight monthly drop. Imports fell 17.6 percent in November, leaving the trade surplus at an all-time monthly high of \$10.4 billion.

DOMESTIC DEMAND BETTER FOR NOW


Consumer inflation data and the manufacturing survey, meanwhile, suggested that domestic demand held firm in November, which supported optimism expressed by the government and the central bank for a consumption-led economic recovery. The November inflation rate edged up to 1.0 percent from a year earlier, a one-year high and beating expectations. The Nikkei/Markit purchasing managers' indexes underscored the division between domestic and overseas demand. New export orders fell more sharply in November than in October but orders from domestic customers improved.

Data from the country's top mortgage lender showed on Monday that house prices rose for a 27th straight month in November on-month, bringing annual growth to the fastest since March 2012.

Still unless global demand improves, some analysts believe the Bank of Korea will have to cut rates further next year as price pressures are still weak and domestic demand will eventually succumb to the effects of the prolonged export slump. "Given weak exports, low inflation, a tight 2016 budget, and micro tightening for household loans, we expect another policy rate cut in H1 of 2016," economists at Goldman Sachs said. The BOK cut its policy rate by a combined 50 basis points in two steps in March and June this year to a record-low 1.50 percent. Views in financial markets are currently split between favoring no change in South Korean interest rates for some months ahead, or a cut early in 2016. — Reuters

BOE'S CARNEY SAYS UK BANKS' JOB ALMOST DONE ON CAPITAL

FURTHER INCREASES IN CAPITAL WILL ONLY BE INCREMENTAL

LONDON: British banks including HSBC and Lloyds have almost completed the job of building up their defences against a future financial crisis, Bank of England Governor Mark Carney said yesterday as he set out details of new capital

Banks may have to hold up to 10 billion pounds (\$15 billion) more capital to meet rules designed to link the capital they must hold to protect against financial risks to the state of the economy, a relatively small sum compared with the hundreds of billions they have raised to strengthen their position since the financial crisis. Carney was keen to dispel banks' fears that the BoE was going further than international rules required, and acknowledged that excess capital requirements could hurt growth. "With today's announcement, the basic amount of capital our system requires is settled," he said, setting out plans for top UK banks including HSBC, Lloyds, Barclays after their annual health check.

RBS and Standard Chartered only passed after taking remedial action." While the benefits of increased resilience are clear, higher capital costs are ultimately passed on to borrowers," he said. British finance minister George Osborne has called for a "new settlement" with banks after introducing a welter of tougher rules. Carney said there was absolutely no political pressure on the BoE to ease the pressure on lenders. The BoE's Financial Policy Committee "seems positively relaxed about the current state of the banking system", said Samuel Tombs at Pantheon Macroeconomics.

The BoE also released the results of annual 'stress tests' into how Britain's big seven lenders would deal with unexpected economic shocks.

This year the focus was on emerging market and trading risks, and Royal Bank of Scotland (RBS) and Standard Chartered both only passed thanks to steps they took to improve their capital ratios during the process, which lifted their leverage ratios above the minimum 3 percent level.

The other five big lenders tested - HSBC, Barclays, Lloyds Banking Group, Santander and Nationwide - did not have to take action. "RBS was always still further behind in the journey but Lloyds and Barclays are fine, with no material threats of further capital raising or, in Lloyds' case, growing dividends over time," Richard Buxton, CEO of Old Mutual Global Investors, a shareholder in RBS, Barclays and Lloyds, told Reuters. Shares in Barclays were up 3.9 percent at 1145 GMT, RBS was up 3.2 percent, Lloyds was up 2.6 percent and HSBC up 1.8 percent as investors breathed a sigh of relief that the outlook on capital requirements was clearer.

The BoE said that credit conditions were largely back to normal after the financial crisis and therefore banks should hold an extra so-called counter-cyclical capital buffer (CCB) of percent of risk-weighted assets during such times - equivalent to 10 billion pounds across the system.

The BoE was now tweaking the requirements individual banks must meet with a view to imposing the add-on buffer step-by-step from March. The CCB aims to rein in risky lending at frothier stages of the credit cycle. It stands at zero currently, but the BoE has already required some banks to hold extra capital due to firm-specific risks, meaning some lenders may not have to raise much fresh capital.

Some economists and banking analysts had expected the

BoE to raise the CCB this month to 0.5 percent. The BoE also said it expected the banking sector as a whole to hold highgrade tier one equity capital of 13.5 percent of risk-weighted assets by 2019, up from 13 percent now.

The 13.5 percent figure is equivalent to 12 or 12.5 percent of best quality core equity, a level some banks already have. The BoE has said it wanted to give banks more clarity about its long-run aims for the amount of capital they hold. Banks have complained that in the past, the BoE has unexpectedly piled on extra capital requirements, making it hard for them to lend or decide which lines of business to stay in.

HIGHER RATE RISK

The BoE Financial Policy Committee's report comes as markets brace for the United States to raise interest rates later this month for the first time since the financial crisis

"Financial market prices remain vulnerable to a sharp increase in market interest rates or the compensation demanded by investors for risky assets," the report said.

With the BoE's Monetary Policy Committee unlikely to raise British interest rates until later next year, the FPC is having to take other steps to guard against risky behaviour.

Even if domestic cost pressures are too weak to warrant a rate rise, British consumer and mortgage lending is growing at

its fastest rate since the financial crisis. So-called buy-to-let mortgages - which enable small land-

lords to purchase property to rent out - showed weaker underwriting standards than residential mortgages and the BoE's Prudential Regulation Authority said it was examining this. The FPC said it stood ready to take action if needed and would monitor closely the impact of higher property transaction taxes for buy-to-let purchases which finance minister George Osborne announced last week and will take effect next April. —Reuters

Approval for the bourse was given by Maung Maung Thein, the chairman of the securities and exchange commission, according to statebacked newspaper the Global New Light of

About five companies will be listed on the YEX to start with, the official was quoted as saying. Myanmar is one of just a handful of countries without a stock market. In 1996 Japanese firm Daiwa Securities and a state bank set up the Myanmar Securities Exchange Centre, but this allowed over-the-counter sales of shares in just two firms, a Myanmar timber company and

The workings of a bourse remain a mystery to most ordinary people, a nation where many keep their money at home and the banking system is still in its infancy after decades of state control over the economy. But with controls easing since reforms began in 2011, local companies hope soon to be able to access more capital and woo investors.

"It is the first step for us and it will bring new economic opportunities for us," Aung Tun Thet, an economic adviser to the president, told AFP.

"The most important thing is a systematic and disciplined process for running companies." Businessmen have broadly welcomed the exchange but there are concerns a new and poorly regulated bourse could attract dirty money, in a country where corruption runs deep. "It is very important to prevent the stock exchange becoming a place for money-laundering," said Aung Thura, an economic expert and head of the Thura Swiss market research company. Official media says state-owned Myanma Economic Bank will own a controlling 51 percent stake in the YEX, with the remainder divided between Japanese partners the Japan Exchange Group and Daiwa Institute of Research, the research arm of Daiwa Securities Group. —AFP

GOOGLE OPENS ONLINE WINDOW ON TOLL OF CLIMATE CHANGE

SAN FRANCISCO: As world leaders gathered in Paris on Monday in the hope to stopping catastrophic climate change, Google Maps provided online views of remote locations where wildlife is struggling for survival. A "Street View" feature at the free online map service has grown from simply showing scenes outside of business or residential addresses to allowing arm chair adventurers to virtually explore mountains, rain forests, ocean depths and more.

Some settings find creatures in dire straits, such as polar bear in the Canadian Arctic appearing to desperately wait for bay ice that doesn't form

because temperatures are too warm. "From polar bears in the Canadian Arctic, to communities in the Brazilian Amazon, to blue oak trees in Central California, the impacts of climate change are being felt by plants, animals and people across the planet," said Google Earth outreach program manager Karin Tuxen-Bettman. "With Street View, you can get a window into some of our world's changing ecosystems, and learn how nonprofit and other organizations are working to keep our planet healthy."


Polar Bears International (PBI) borrowed Street View Trekker 360-degree camera and location-pinpointing gear

to enhance maps with scenes of polar bears in Manitoba as the sea ice on which they depend vanishes. PBI incorporated the Street View scenes into its website and a lesson plan for schools to help children learn about the habitat. Brazilian nonprofit Amazonas Sustainable Foundation (FAS) used Trekker Gear to capture scenes in the Amazon forest and put isolated local communities on the map. FAS captured imagery from three reserves in the Amazon and uses it for education about rain forest protection and sustainable ecosystem management, according to

Visualizing climate change

The initiatives aims to make climate change more real for people and inspire them to act by allowing them to virtually explore remote areas, and see beauty lost or under threat due to climate change. Street View imagery also allows for comparisons over time to show how environments are changing along with the climate. "Street View is great for visualizing the impacts of climate change, but we're also using our Street View platform to measure climate data, which can be used by scientists, policymakers, businesses and citizens to drive better decisions," Tuxen-Bettman said.

Google Earth has worked for several years with the Environmental Defense Fund to map methane leaks from natural gas lines under an array of US cities by equipping Street View cars with special gear, according to Tuxen-Bettman. Street View cars will begin measuring more pollutants, such as climate change culprit carbon dioxide, in an alliance with environmental sensor network specialty firm Aclima, according to Californiabased Google. "Essentially, we're turning Street View cars into environmental sensing platforms," Tuxen-Bettman said, noting that they will first be put to work in California communities. — AFP

CLONE FACTORY' SCIENTIST EYES HUMAN REPLICATION

CHINA CLONING PIONEER OFFERS VISION OF BRAVE NEW WORLD

BEIJING: The Chinese scientist behind the world's biggest cloning factory has technology advanced enough to replicate humans, he said and is only holding off for fear of the public reaction. Boyalife Group and its partners are building the giant plant in the northern Chinese port of Tianjin, where it is due to go into production within the next seven months and aims for an output of one million cloned cows a year by 2020. But cattle are only the beginning of chief executive Xu Xiaochun's ambitions. In the factory pipeline are also thoroughbred racehorses, as well as pet and police dogs, specialized in searching and sniffing.

Boyalife is already working with its South Korean partner Sooam and the Chinese Academy of Sciences to improve primate cloning capacity to create better test animals for disease research. And it is a short biological step from monkeys to humans-potentially raising a host of moral and ethical controversies. "The technology is already there," Xu said. "If this is allowed, I don't think there are other companies better than Boyalife that make better technology." The firm does not currently engage in human cloning activities, Xu said, adding that it has to be "self-restrained" because of possible adverse reaction.

But social values can change, he pointed out, citing changing views of homosexuality and suggesting that in time humans could have more choices about their own reproduction. "Unfortunately, currently, the only way to have a child is to have it be half its mum, half its dad," he said. "Maybe in the future you have three choices instead of one," he went on. "You either have fifty-fifty, or you have a choice of having the genetics 100 percent from Daddy or 100 percent from Mummy. This is only a choice." Xu, 44, went to university in

Canada and the US, and has previously worked for US pharmaceutical giant Pfizer, and in drug development.

Snuppy the cloned dog

Presenting cloning as a safeguard of biodiversity, the Tianjin facility will house a gene bank capable of holding up to approximately five million cell samples frozen in liquid nitrogen-a catalogue of the world's endangered species for future regeneration. Boyalife's South Korean partner Sooam is already working on a project to bring the woolly mammoth back from extinction by cloning cells preserved for thousands of years in the Siberian permafrost. Sooam also serves a niche market recreating customers' dead pet dogs, reportedly for \$100,000 a time. Sooam founder Hwang Woo-Suk was a national hero with his own postage stamp before being embroiled in controversy a decade ago after his claims to be the first in the world to clone a human embryo were discredited.

Hwang, who created Snuppy, the world's first cloned dog, in 2005, lost his university position, had two major papers retracted, and was accused of crimes ranging from violation of bioethics laws to embezzling research funds. Earlier this year he was quoted in South Korea's Dong-A Ilbo newspaper saying that his firm was planning a cloning joint venture in China "because of South Korea's bioethics law that prohibits the use of human eggs". "We have decided to locate the facilities in China in case we enter the phase of applying the technology to human bodies," he was quoted as saying.

'Weird experiments'For now, Xu seeks to become the world's first pur-

pharmaceutical giant Pfizer, and in drug development. su al

veyor of "cloned" beef, breeding genetically identical super-cattle that he promises will taste like Kobe and allow butchers to "slaughter less and produce more" to meet the demands of China's booming middle class. Cloning differs from genetic modification, but its application to animals would enable the firm to homogenize its output.

"Everything in the supermarket looks good-it's almost all shiny, good-looking, and uniformly shaped. For animals, we weren't able to do that in the past. But with our cloning factory, we choose to do so now," Xu said. "Remember, this is a food. We want it to be uniform, very consistent, very premium quality," he added. There is controversy over whether cloned beef is safe for human consumption research by the US Food and Drug Administration says that it is, but the European parliament has backed a ban on cloned animals and products in the food chain.

The UN's Food and Agriculture Organization has yet to review the issue. Han Lanzhi, a GMO safety specialist at the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Sciences, said Boyalife's claims about the safety, scope and timeline of their operations were alarming-and implausible. "To get approval for the safety of cloned animals would be a very drawn-out process, so when I heard this news, I felt very surprised," she said. "There must be strong regulation because as a company pursuing its own interests, they could very easily do other things in the future," she added. Xu sought to be reassuring said: "We want the public to see that cloning is really not that crazy, that scientists aren't weird, dressed in lab coats, hiding behind a sealed door doing weird experiments." — AFP

AMAZON GIVES NEW DRONE DETAILS, MUM ON TIMELINE

NEW YORK: Amazon is giving new details on its Prime Air drone delivery program. But the timeline is still unclear. The retailer says Prime Air will one day deliver packages up to 5 pounds in 30 minutes or less using small drones. The drones will fly under 400 feet and weigh less than 55 pounds, according to details posted on its website Sunday. It says it will use technology and automation to operate safely. Seattle-based Amazon.com Inc. said Monday the pro-

gram will start once government regulations are in place to support it. It has development centers in the US, the UK and Israel. The FAA currently bans commercial drone flights but has granted several thousand waivers. It has granted Amazon approval to fly drones for research. This story has been corrected to show that the FAA has granted waivers of its ban on commercial drone flights to several thousand, rather than just a few dozen, companies. — AP

SAMSUNG PICKS NEW SMARTPHONE HEAD

SEOUL: Tech giant Samsung Electronics Co Ltd's long-time handset division chief is ceding day-to-day management of the struggling smartphone business in the biggest leadership change yet under the Samsung conglomerate's heir-apparent, Jay Y Lee. Samsung Group said 54-year-old Dongjin Koh will take over as president of the mobile communications business from 59-year-old JK Shin, who will remain head of the overall mobile division for Samsung Electronics and focus on long-term strategy and developing new growth businesses.

The move diminishes Shin's influence on the mobile business as the former cash-cow battles to reverse a slide in its market share to rivals like Apple Inc, Huawei Technologies Co Ltd and Xiaomi Inc. "While it's true that Shin delivered remarkable performance in the past, it's indisputable that the Galaxy S6's results fell short of expectations so a new leader was needed," Hansung University economics Professor Kim Sang-jo said. "Today's appointments appear to acknowledge the need to develop a management system that can more proactively respond to challenges from Xiaomi and other Chinese companies."

The group's annual announcement of management changes also saw another top executive moved into a strategic role, with TV and appliances division chief Yoon Bookeun shifted out of the day-to-day operations of the appliances business. Analysts said that while the moves at the mobile division were an apparent acknowledgment that change was needed, they did not expect a new strategy to emerge any time

"Koh is basically the same person as Shin," Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology business professor Chang Sea-jin said. Analysts have said Samsung needed to step up its software and services offerings to revive its mobile business, but Koh, who has held mobile business roles since 2006, had an engineering background like Shin. "There is no real change and Samsung appears to be continuing on the hardware-centric path," Chang said.

Mobile struggles

Jay Y Lee, 47, has been the de facto leader of the smartphones-to-construction conglomerate since his father and group patriarch, Lee Kun-hee, was hospitalized following a heart attack last year. Under the younger Lee's leadership, the group has faced mounting investor pressure to boost shareholder returns and find new growth engines as the smartphone business slows. Shin, in charge of the mobile business since 2009, was instrumental in delivering record profits through the sales of Galaxy smartphones before a sharp earnings decline starting last year appeared to put his standing at risk. Some media reports said he was on the way out last year. Samsung has implemented new designs and cut prices for high-end products to boost sales, but researchers say its global market share continued to fall from a year earlier during the third quarter. "This is basically a retirement for Shin," Chang said. Others however said that Shin could still exert influence through his role as mobile division chief.

Samsung said Koh, previously head of Samsung's mobile research and development, played an important role in the development of premium devices such as the Galaxy S6 and the Galaxy Note 5. The company touted his experience in helping to develop software and services such as its mobile payments service and the KNOX security platform. "Jay Y Lee has yet to assume the role of chairman so there's still some time before we see bigger-scale changes," said Chung Sun-sup, head of corporate analysis firm Chaebul.com. — Reuters

HOW CAN PEOPLE SAFELY TAKE CONTROL OF SELF-DRIVING CARS?

LOS ANGELES: New cars that can steer and brake themselves risk lulling people in the driver's seat into a false sense of security - and even to sleep. One way to keep people alert may be providing distractions that are now illegal. That was one surprising finding when researchers put Stanford University students in a simulated self-driving car to study how they reacted when their robo-chauffer needed help.

The experiment was one in a growing number that assesses how cars can safely hand control back to a person when their self-driving software and sensors are overwhelmed or overmatched. With some models already able to stay in their lane or keep a safe distance from other traffic, and automakers pushing for more automation, the car-to-driver handoff is a big open question.

The elimination of distracted driving is a major selling point for the technology. But in the Stanford experiment, reading or watching a movie helped keep participants awake. Among the 48 students put in the driver's seat, 13 who were instructed to monitor the car and road began to nod off. Only three did so when told to watch a video or read from a tablet. Alertness mattered when students needed to grab the wheel because a simulated car or pedestrian got in the way.

There's no consensus on the right car-to-driver handoff approach: the Stanford research suggests engaging people with media could help, while some automakers are marketing vehicles with limited self-driving features that will slow the car if they detect a person has stopped paying attention to the road. Though research is ongoing, it appears that people need at least 5 seconds to take over - if they're not totally checked out. Self-driving car experts at Google, which is pursuing the technology more aggressively than any automaker, concluded that involving humans would make its cars less safe. Google's solution is a prototype with no steering wheel or pedals - human control would be limited to go and stop buttons.

Auto pilot

Meanwhile, traditional automakers are phasing in the technology. Mercedes and Toyota sell cars that can hit the brakes and stay in their lane. By adding new features each year, they might produce a truly self-driving car in about a decade. One potential hazard of this gradualist approach became clear this fall, when Tesla Motors had to explain that its "auto pilot" feature did not mean drivers could stop paying attention. Several videos posted online showed people recording the novelty - then seizing the wheel when the car made a startling move. Starting late next year, the Cadillac CTS will get a Super Cruise system, which will allow semiautonomous highway driving. If the driver's eyes are off the road, and they don't respond to repeated prodding, the car slows. "We are in no way selling this as a technology where the driver can check out," General Motors spokesman Dan Flores said. "You can relax, glance away, but you still have to be aware because you know the technology's not foolproof."

One riddle automakers must solve: How to get owners to trust the technology so they'll use it - but not trust it so much that they'll be lulled into a false sense of

security and therefore slower to react when the car needs them. Trust was on the mind of researchers who in August published an extensive report on self-driving cars funded by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. "Although this trust is essential for widespread adoption, participants were also observed prioritizing non-driving activities over the operation of the vehicle." the authors wrote.

'Mode confusion'

Another wide-open question: How to alert the person in the driver's seat of the need to take over. It appears that the car should appeal to several senses. Visual warnings alone may not suffice. But combine a light with spoken instructions or physical stimulation such as a vibrating seat, and people react more quickly. "If it is done courteously and subtle and not annoying, it could be missed by someone that is distracted," said Greg Fitch, a research scientist at the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute. Then again, the way the car interacts with people will be one way automakers differentiate their product - and overbearing warnings may

GROUP FUNDED BY COKE TO FIGHT OBESITY DISBANDING

NEW YORK: A nonprofit funded by the Coca-Cola Co. to combat obesity is disbanding following revelations about the beverage maker's involvement with the group. The Global Energy Balance Network said on its website Monday night that it is "discontinuing operations due to resource limitations." The

received an "unrestricted gift" from Coke and that the Atlanta-based soft drink giant had "no input" into its activities. But last week, The Associated Press reported on emails showing that Coke helped with the selection of the group's leaders, edited its mission statement



group had previously said that it When contacted about the exchanges, Coke CEO Muhtar Kent said in a statement there wasn't enough transparency regarding the company's involvement.

Coke also told the AP that it accepted the retirement of Rhona Applebaum, its chief health and science officer who initially managed the relationship with the group. The company said it was no longer working with the Global Energy Balance Network. The emails obtained by the AP through a records request showed Coke executives and the group's leaders held meetings and conference calls to develop the group's mission. A proposal circulated via email at Coke laid out a vision for a group that would "quickly establish itself as the place the media goes to for comment on any obesity issue." It said the group would run a political-style campaign to counter the "shrill rhetoric" of "public health extremists."

Early on, Applebaum also informed the group's president that those involved would need to be open about collaboration with private industry. "That is non-negotiable," she wrote. Relatively minor matters, such as the group's logo, were also covered. "Color will not be an issue - except for blue. Hope you can understand why," Applebaum. Coke is known for its red logo, while Pepsi is associated with blue. The Global Energy Balance Network, led by a professor at the University of Colorado School of Medicine, initially came under fire in August after The New York Times reported on the group's funding by Coke. On Nov. 6, the University of Colorado said it was returning a \$1 million donation from the company because of the distraction it was creating. The announcement came after the

The University of South Carolina has said it is keeping a \$500,000 donation it received for the group and that there was no misuse of funds. One of the

school released hundreds of emails to

the AP.

school's professors is also a group leader. Coca-Cola said Monday night it had no comment and deferred questions about the status of its donation to the University of South Carolina. A representative for the university did not respond to a request for comment Monday. Critics say Coke touts the idea of "energy balance," or the need to offset calorie intake with physical activity, to deflect negative attention over its sugary drinks by stressing the need for exercise. James Hill, the group's president and a professor at the University of Colorado School of Medicine, did not respond to a request for comment. Steven Blair, the group's vice president and a professor at the University of South Carolina, also did not respond. Both had financial ties to Coca-Cola prior to the formation of the Global Energy Balance Network. For instance, Coke paid Hill \$5,000 for at least one speaking engagement overseas. His travel expenses were also covered by the company. —AP

CERTAIN BIRTH DEFECTS LINKED TO ABUSE OF INFANTS AND TODDLERS

NEW YORK: Babies with certain birth defects are much more likely to be abused as infants and toddlers than other young children, a US study suggests. Babies with malformations of the mouth and jaw known as cleft lip and palate were 40 percent more likely to be abused by their second birthday than those born without birth defects, the analysis of about 3 million children in Texas found. For infants born with spina bifida, a spinal cord disorder linked to lower limb paralysis and cognitive delays, the odds of maltreatment were 58 percent higher, researchers reported in the journal Pediatrics.

Down syndrome, a chromosomal defect tied to physical abnormalities and intellectual impairment, didn't appear to make abuse any more likely by age two than it would be for babies born without birth defects, the study also found. "Understanding the factors that place children at an increased risk for maltreatment is crucial for prevention," said study leader Bethanie Van Horne, assistant director for state initiatives for the Children's Learning Institute at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston.

"Parenting is challenging - even for typically developing children in well-resourced homes," Van Horne added by email. "The medical complications of birth defects like spina bifida or cleft lip or cleft palate add another level of stress and complexity to infant care." To explore the connection between birth defects and maltreatment, Van Horne and colleagues reviewed data from a registry of birth defects for children born in Texas from 2002 to 2009 as well as state records on reported abuse. The vast majority of children in the study were born without birth defects. About 3,700 had Down syndrome, while roughly 2,900 had cleft lip or palate and almost 1,000 had spina bifida.

Overall, about 67,000 of these children had a substantiated case of maltreatment by their second birthday, a prevalence of 23 cases for each 1,000 kids. For Down syndrome, the prevalence was similar, with 20 cases of abuse for each 1,000 children. The prevalence of abuse was higher - 36 per 1,000 with cleft lip and palate and higher still - 38 per 1,000 - with spina bifida. It's possible that fewer infants and toddlers with Down syndrome experienced abuse by age two in the study because these infants initially look and act very similar to babies without birth defects, Van Horne said.

Among the maltreated children, the infants with cleft lip and palate or spina bifida were about two to three times more likely to experience abuse in their first month of life. The most common type of abuse was neglect or lack of supervision, followed by physical abuse, physical neglect or medical neglect, the study found. One shortcoming of the study is that abuse noted for certain families in the study might not have always involved the specific infant included in the study and might have instead been related to another child in the household, the authors acknowledge. Abuse cases reported outside of Texas were also not part of the study, which might have contributed to an underestimate of maltreatment.

Even so, the findings suggest that when babies have visible birth defects that impact interactions with them, parents may need extra support from clinicians to come to terms with anger, grief or other feelings that can surface when babies have abnormalities, said Dr Bruno Grollemund, a specialist in orthodontics and member of the Strasbourg cleft competence center in France. "This is particularly important for midwives and pediatric nurses who are the medical staff in whom parents confide most readily," Grollemund, who wasn't involved in the study, said by email. "If full use is made of these teams and careful attention is paid to the child as a unique being, the parents will feel less isolated, and will be in a better position to reach the decisions that will affect their future."

Children may fare even worse in the developing world, according to Erin Stieber. Stieber works for Smile Train, an international charity devoted to cleft repair surgeries. "Poorer regions lack the resources and training to treat cleft and to address the special needs associated with it such as difficulty eating, breathing and speaking - which can lead to social isolation and shame," Stieber, who wasn't involved in the study, said by email. "The challenge is often complicated by a lack of understanding, even negative mythology, about the causes of

MOSQUITOS SPREAD MICROCEPHALY IN BRAZIL

BRASÕLIA: Cases of microcephaly, which causes babies to be born with small heads, are skyrocketing in Brazil and the discovery that mosquitoes carry the disease means there are few ways to stop it, officials said Monday. Latest figures show 1,248 cases this year, compared to just 147 last year, said the health ministry. Complicating the situation is the revelation that mosquitos carrying the dengue-like Zika virus are spreading microcephaly, which also curbs mental development in the baby, Claudio Maierovitch, director of the epidemiology

department at the health ministry, said.

"The control of the sickness depends on control of the transmitter, in this case the mosquito," he said. "There is currently no specific treatment for the Zika virus," Maierovitch said. "That is what worries the Brazilian government." Zika, which is related to dengue, has been detected in 14 of Brazil's 27 states this year. Microcephaly is seen as an alarming new trend which threatens women especially in the first three months of pregnancy. The health ministry is in talks with the World Health Organization and two US specialists are expected to arrive in Brazil within days. —AFP

ENTRAL AMERICA TESTS DROUGHT-RESISTANT BEANS

QUEZALTEPEQUE, El Salvador: "These beans are miraculous because they beat droughts," crowed Manuel Ceren, a farmer in El Salvador trying out a hybrid, climate change-defying crop produced by Salvadoran, Colombian and Honduran experts. In Quezaltepeque, a village 30 kilometers north of San Salvador, Ceren and 13 other co-farmers feel fortunate to be the first testing the bean. They proudly showed off an abundant harvest of around 0.7 of a hectare (1.7 acres) of the bean grown on the farm where they work, to the awed gaze of visitors. "We were very careful with this initial experiment with these beans, which were hit with a 15-day drought and

two storms," the 45-year-old manager of the farm, Baltazar Garcia, told AFP.

"Other people called us crazy. But today a lot of them are admiring the harvest." The type of light red bean they are using, which is also resistant to an infection known as bean golden yellow mosaic virus, was painstakingly developed with the help of El Salvador's National Center for Agricultural and Forestry Technology (CENTA). Dubbed CENTA-EAC, the bean is not a biotech crop designed by genetic engineers slicing up chromosomes. Rather it is the product of hybridization: the combining of naturally formed plants to form a cross-breed. "You could say it's

the simple cross-fertilization of red bean and black bean plants in a process that in this case took five years of selecting and discarding plants until the desired variety was created," a CENTA researcher, Aldemaro Clara, explained.

A search for better crops

The Salvadoran experiment came as a prolonged drought settled on Central America this year, causing heavy crop losses across a broad swathe of land stretching from Costa Rica to Guatemala. Because of the lack of water, 2.3 million small Central American farmers will need food aid, the UN's World Food Program has warned. The CENTA-EAC bean is part of a decade-old effort by laboratories in the region to come up with hybrids able to survive and even prosper during the recurring droughts. With the help of farmers, it was noted that it was possible to come up with crops adapted to extreme weather conditions.

"Our mission to produce seeds resistant to climate change, which in this region means against high temperatures, long droughts and extremely heavy rainy seasons," Rolando Ventura, another CENTA researcher, said. The whole region is working along the same lines. In Guatemala, scientists are working on the ICTA-Chorti, which will not only resist droughts but also be rich in iron. In Nicaragua, another institute has made a variety of red bean, the INTA-Tomabu, also able to survive when water is scarce.

Corn, tomatoes and cacao

Candida Lazon, who is trying out that bean on her farm, said: "Here, it almost never rains. We have managed to grow the INTA-Tomabu bean by watering it just once every 12 days. I'm thrilled about this seed because it adapts to the very dry local climate." It's not beans that are being made to "adapt" to climate change. In Panama, one of the first countries in the region to work with types of corn resistant to changing weather, has come up with a new seed. "In the case of corn, these seeds are compatible with higher temperatures, 35 to 36 degrees (95 to 97 degrees Fahrenheit), and drought-tolerant," said Jose Alberto Yau, deputy director for seeds at the country's IDIAP Agriculture and Fishing Research

In El Salvador, farmers already have the option of using a type of corn called CENTA-Pasaquina, but it has fallen from favor because of its perceived low yield. Nicaragua meanwhile has a type of virus-resistant tomato seed christened INTA-Jinotega that copes with temperatures over 25 degrees centigrade. In Costa Rica, it's cocoa-a crop essential to the economy-that is being looked at in the Tropical Agricultural Research and Higher Education Center with hopes of coming up with a more resistant variety. —AFP

HIV STIGMA IN UGANDA PUTS MOTHERS AND BABIES AT RISK

LONDON: When Juliet Nalumu, overjoyed at her first pregnancy, visited her local hospital in eastern Uganda for a check-up, it turned into one of the worst days of her life. She found out she was HIV positive. "All the joy and happiness disappeared." Lonely, and terrified of telling her husband of two years, the 26year-old decided to keep it a secret. "I was his third wife, and the youngest, so by going home and telling him I was HIV positive, both he and his other wives would believe I'd brought the infection

into the family." 'They'd probably chase me out of the house. I depended on him entirely - he was the breadwinner. We would have had nothing to live on," Nalumu said while on a visit to London ahead of World Aids Day. Nalumu's story is not unusual in eastern Uganda - and in many parts of Africa - where women are entirely dependent on their husbands for food, shelter and medicine, and where stigma against AIDS is common. With only one month's supply of anti-retroviral drugs, and the hospital a two-hour bus ride from her village in Kamuli district, she did not want to raise suspicions by returning for more medication. "I became very sick. They had to carry me to the hospital. I had tuberculosis and I was very wasted,"

she said. Even after giving birth while sick and very thin, she said nothing to her family. She was told by a nurse she had to exclusively breastfeed her twins to protect her children from the virus. Severely malnourished, she was unable to do so. About 40 percent of infections from mother to child happen when babies are fed a combination of breast milk and formula milk or other foods. The combination irritates the intestinal lining making children more susceptible to the virus. One of her twins fell ill at four months and died. Her other daughter developed similar symptoms at nine months but survived. "This time I said for the sake of this innocent child I had to do my best. I did casual work for my neighbours, anything to raise money to get me back to the hospital."

Dramatic scale-up

An estimated 7.3 percent of people in Uganda aged 15 to 49 years old have HIV. Globally nearly 37 million people are living with the virus. Nalumu's fortunes changed four years later when she started working as a mentor for mothers2mothers, an international charity helping mothers with HIV. "I now had a voice, a salary," she said. But before she could start work, she had to tell her family she had the virus. The whole family was checked for HIV. Her husband and one co-wife tested

positive. He was supportive, but some of her other relatives were less so. One of her sisters asked her to hand over her assets, now that she was earning money, saying she would die soon. Neighbors asked her why she was doing training, as they assumed she would die before the end of the course. But her health improved, and armed with the medication and knowledge she needed, she went on to have two children who are virus-free. She now helps other mothers struggling with the virus, and teaches them how they and their children can lead normal, healthy

"HIV is just in my blood and that is all. I have a very normal life." Her eldest daughter Joelia, now eight years old, still struggles with her health. Last year she demanded to know why she alone of all her siblings had to take medication every day. Her parents finally explained she had been infected with HIV through breast-

"I felt so much pain, I could cry day and night," Nalumu said. Over the last 15 years, scale-up of treatment has been most dramatic in Africa where now more than 11 million people are receiving HIV treatment, up from 11,000 at the turn of the century, the World Health Organization said on Monday. Mothers2mothers reaches a quarter of all pregnant women in the nine countries in which they work.

Women are put on ARVs as soon as they test positive, and stay on the treatment for life. This reduces the risk of transmitting the virus to their children and partners. Babies are given a short treatment of drugs as soon as they are born, in case they were infected during childbirth. And women are encouraged to feed their children exclusively formula milk - an expense many cannot afford - or breast milk. As a result of these measures, mother to child transmission has been reduced to near zero, according to mothers2mothers. —Reuters

HAIR TRANSPLANT PROCEDURES POPULAR AMONGST YOUTH IN IRAN

TEHRAN: Hair transplant have become very popular among youth in Iran due to its high success rate, low cost and effectiveness in sustaining as well as retaining individuals' youthful looks. Speaking to KUNA on the popularity of hair transplant, specialist and Dermatologist Dr Torg Makrami said that youth were increasingly seeking treatment for the lack of hair on their heads, opting for the hair transplant procedure as a solution for their baldness which is mainly due to genetic reasons.

Clients usually are young men or older people who are seeking to retain their youthful looks, said Dr Makrami, adding that women were also amongst his clients. On the procedure, Dr Makrami said that the hair transplant usually was conducted without general anesthesia and it would take around four to six hours to get done depending on the amount of hair being transplanted.

hair. The amount of hair pulled from the back of the head should not exceed 50 percent otherwise a visible mark will be left after the operation, said the specialist, adding that the hair planted in the bald spots would not fall at all due to the fact that the transplanted hair will not be affected by the body's hormance.

Dr Makrami said that hair transplanting was not an independent branch of medicine, adding that it was taught within dermatology at college level. He noted that medical students are required to take specialized courses in hair transplanting before being able to conduct the procedure legally. On his part, Abbas Burhani, 45, said that he had went for the hair transplanting procedure and was flabbergasted by the good results. As for the reasons, Burhani said that he was eager to look younger and therefore he underwent hair transplanting. The procedure was easy and less risky than other operations and the results are great, said Burhani. —KUNA

SENEGALESE VILLAGES SWALLOWED BY THE SEA

SAINT LOUIS, Senegal: Behind the remains of washed-away fences, crumbling houses dot an expanse of the northern Senegalese coastline where a swollen river and an advancing sea are swallowing villages whole. The fishing community of Goxu Mbath is one of many districts in the city of Saint Louis, the former colonial capital of French west Africa that, little by little, is disappearing under water. "The waves surprised us at night. It was October 20. The water hit hard and knocked down walls," says Awa Sarr Fall, 68, outside her badly damaged oceanfront house. "We are calling for the help of the state and we're willing to move elsewhere."

The village is on the Langue de Barbarie, a densely populated spit of land that is home to nearly 120,000 people. Colorful dugout canoes are berthed on the sandy former peninsula, which protects the heart of the old colonial city from the Atlantic's fearsome breakers. An archipelago in the mouth of the Senegal River often referred to as the "Venice of Africa", St Louis is anchored precariously between the fast-flowing currents of the swollen waterway and the ocean. A 2008 UN-HABITAT report listed the city of 250,000, which is plagued by flooding during the rainy season when the river overflows, as the most vulnerable in Africa to rising sea levels.

The upheavals "are in part linked to climate change", but also "people have poorly designed their habitat space", says Pape Gombo Lo, a professor at Cheikh Anta Diop University in Dakar. Named after Louis XIV, the UNESCO World Heritage site on the Mauritanian border was founded in 1659, becoming the first French settlement of l'Afrique Occidentale, trading in

Scientists say climate change is exacerbating the problem with increasingly heavy rain and a rise in the sea level. On a visit to Senegal in 2014, the UN special representative on disaster risk, Margareta Wahlstrom, expressed concern for the fate of coastal and riverside towns, with some mayors telling her their villages spent 10 months out of 12 underwater. "We want to move but we don't have the means. No authority has come to see us since the damage," says Abibatou Fall, another Goxu Mbath resident.

Pessimism

In 2003, heavy rain in the drainage basin of the Senegal River alarmed the authorities who, fearing flooding, dug a new channel for the river water across the Langue de Barbarie. As the sea flooded into the river mouth the canal widened, from four meters at the outset to a gaping breach that is five kilometers (three miles) wide today. "The forecasts are pessimistic for the Langue de Barbarie," says Balla Gueye, the city official in charge of the environment.

"The whole coast of St Louis is threatened," he said, adding that the city council had called on the state for help. By way of response, the government recently announced a breakwater construction project that will cost one billion CFA francs (\$1.6 million, 1.5 million euros).

The island community of Doune Baba Dieye, situated about ten minutes by motorized canoe from the mouth of the river, was the first casualty in St Louis. "The water has engulfed the island and the people are gone," said the former village chief, Ameth Sene Diagne.

Shipwrecked

Diagne and his 800 neighbors had made their living from the precious mullet, sardines, bonga and tilapia that once thrived in the mangroves but disappeared after the salt water of the Atlantic began encroaching into the river. Diagne, a father of 16 children from two wives, was the last to flee when the sea claimed his village in 2012. "All this is due to the breach," says Diagne, one of the lucky ones who had

sometimes shipwrecked on sandbanks, says El Hadji Boubacar Dia, a local environmental official, estimating at nearly 200 the number of people killed since 2003. Sea turtles and migratory birds are also at grave risk from the loss of habitat. The results of a government study are expected by the end of the year "to see what to do with the breach, to close it or stabilize it," says Moussa Fall, head of the Langue de Barbarie national park. —AFP

FLIES, WASPS, BEETLES ARE IMPORTANT POLLINATORS TOO

MIAMI: Bees are declining worldwide but other insects are just as important for pollinating certain major crops and may be more resilient to environmental changes, scientists said Monday. The study in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, a peer-reviewed US journal, was based on 39 field studies from five different continents. Researchers found that flies, butterflies, moths, beetles, wasps, ants and thrips visit provide, on average, 39 percent of visits to crop flowers.

And crops such as mangoes, custard apples, kiwi fruit, coffee and canola depend on non-bee pollinators, said the study led by Australian researchers. Therefore, farmers who use pesticides that spare bees but kill other insects might be making a mistake, they argued. "We are trying to get the message out there to use scientific findings such as these to promote a change in agricultural practices," said co-author Margie Mayfield, a plant ecologist at the University of Queensland. "The global reliance on honeybees for pollination is a risky strategy given the

threats to the health of managed honeybee populations due to pests and diseases such as Varroa mites and colony collapse disorder," Mayfield added.

"Non-bee insects are an insurance against bee population declines." Until now, little research has focused on the role of non-bee pollinators in the multi-billion dollar agriculture industry. But lead author Romina Rader from the University of New England, Armidale, said the team discovered that non-bee pollinators were crucial to the ecosystem, performing anywhere from 25 to 50 per cent of the total number of flower visits. "Although non-bees were less effective pollinators than bees per flower visit, they provided slightly more visits," Rader said. "These two factors compensated for each other, resulting in pollination services similar to bees." Non-bee pollinators were also found to be less sensitive to habitat fragmentation than bees, offering even more reason to protect them in the future, the authors said. —AFP






EMBASSY OF INDONESIA HOLDS CULTURAL EVENT







The romance and the Kalashnikov: Pashtun cinema reborn

heir tunics drenched in sweat, hundreds gather by the big screen, shouting and dancing their pride in being Pashtun amid clouds of hashish. In Pakistan's northwest, devastated by a decade of terrorism, this is how cinema is done now the local film industry is enjoying a renaissance. In the packed, concrete Arshad Cinema in Peshawar, the air conditioning has failed rendering the darkened room a kind of bathhouse filled with the steam of hashish smoke. No matterthe spectators have fallen silent-gripped by a turning point in the new film they are watching: "Don't Pester the Poor".

On the screen, a slight silhouette enters a gun shop: the mother of the hero, devastated by the death of her husband, a victim of police torture. Facing the arms dealer, she lifts her veil, revealing the withered face of a elderly woman drunk on vengeance, and utters a command: "KA-LASH-NI-KOV!" The room explodes into manly roars of "Yeah!" and "Come on, mother!". The story is of vendetta, that established principle of the Pashtun tribal people living in the borderlands between Afghanistan and Pakistan. Back home, the woman hands the weapon to her son Gul Khan and orders him to avenge his father.

Last year there were two fatal attacks in other cinemas, likely the work of radical Islamists angered by the "perverse" movies, which appeared to have been the death knell for an industry already struggling against competition from the Internet and DVDs. But provincial Peshawar, the cradle of local cinema, has resisted-on the first day of Eid El-Fitr, seven new Pashtun films were released. In this region, where half the population is illiterate and many only speak the local Pashto dialect, cinema has always been able to find an audience.

Frenetic pop

Filmed during the summer in the eastern city of Lahore, home of the Pakistan film industry known as "Lollywood", and in the hills of Murree near Islamabad, "Don't Pester the Poor" was edited in five weeks. At the Peshawar premiere, tickets were selling for 400 rupees (\$4), double the usual price, snapped up in an fair-like atmosphere of jovial masculinity. Faithful to the canon of the Pashtun genre, the hero, Gul Khan, is peaceful, honest and upright-but forced to rebel against oppression, a criminal elite and corrupt police.

Director Arshad Khan adds references to current events-like the death of Gul Khan's nephew in an attack at his school, inspired by the Taliban carnage that killed more than 130 children in Peshawar in late 2014. Romance is another prerequisite. There will of course no kiss between the hero and the beautiful nurse who makes his heart race, but their dances against a backdrop of frenzied local pop are suggestive.

The scene raises the temperature of the already-sweltering cinema. Some hypnotized spectators start to dance, waving their arms. Others roll another joint. But Gul Khan sacrifices his romantic idyll on the altar of revenge, morphing into a sort of local Rambo who goes on a gun rampage in between making dark speeches of vengeance. He and his men eventually spray a convoy with rocket fire, the scene depicted with special effects worthy of a 1970s epic, including lasers transforming each 4X4 into a fireball. At the end of the film, which marches

through its plot without too much downtime, the hero impales his worst enemy, a corrupt deputy, after having amputated both his arms.

Smoke and see girls

It is a far cry from the black and white films of the 1970s, works of art both prudish and poetic which canonized the Pashtun genre. The influence of war, including the conflict ravaging neighboring Afghanistan, has made it more violent; the influence of the West has made it sexier. This "vulgarity", according to the influential local conservatives, has driven away women and families, either because they are unwilling or banned by men from mingling with the working classes who attend the films.

"Scripts could be stronger, but producers make movies for their main audience: illiterate laborers who come to relax, smoke and see action and girls," said Fakr ul Islam, a professor at the University of Peshawar. The film's message is "Give job opportunities to young people instead of pushing them to pick up guns. Otherwise you will get the wrong results," argues the star, Shahid Khan, who plays hero Gul and is brother to director Arshad. On leaving the cinema, many of the audience are satisfied. "The government should listen to the message and take care of us because we are poor!" said one spectator with a nascent mustache. But another youngster says the cinemas "should be closed because they show bad movies in a bad atmosphere for families". Pashto cinema may survived the attacks, but it will take longer for a day at the movies to become a family activity once more. — AFP

Luke Bracey says 'Point Break' remake bigger and better

ollywood actor Luke Bracey said yesterday the remake of the action crime thriller "Point Break" is bigger and better because it's got extreme sports that weren't even invented when the original 1991 hit came out. Bracey is the new Johnny Utah, the FBI agent played by Keanu Reeves in the 1991 movie who goes undercover among a gang of surfers led by Patrick Swayze. In the remake that comes out in China on Friday and in the US on Christmas Day, extreme sports take center stage. Bracey's Utah infiltrates a group of thrill-seeking athletes suspected of being criminals. Action adventure feats include big-wave surfing, wingsuit flying, sheer-face snowboarding, free rock climbing and high-speed motorcycling.

The film's promoters are billing "Point Break" as the first Hollywood film to have its world premier in China, and Bracey, who attended the premiere in Beijing yesterday, said he expected it to be the start of a new trend in Hollywood movies. The movie also stars Venezuelan actor Edgar Ramirez as the athletes' leader Bodhi, Australian actress Teresa Palmer as a surfer, and British actor Ray Winstone. The original film directed by Kathryn Bigelow was a hit that grossed \$83.5 million worldwide - less than the remake's more than \$125 million budget.

Some stunts and sports in the latest movie "hadn't even been thought of when the original was made, in the original they were still paddling into waves," said Bracey. Wing suiting, the sport of flying through the air in a special suit, hadn't been conceived at that time and it was in the mid-1990s that people "started using jet skis just to catch waves that were bigger than they could paddle into." "So, to use a cliche, it's bigger, and it's better and it's just a huge movie in terms of how different it is from the original," he said.

Young age

The Australian actor said that while the original was based in California, the remake has been "expanded across the world." It was filmed in nine countries in four continents, : including scenes of wingsuit flying in : Switzerland, free rock climbing in Venezuela, snowboarding in the Italian Alps and surfing in Hawaii. The world has become more interconnected since the last movie, so "what occurs on one side of the world doesn't just: affect that side of the world these days, it affects the other side of the world in terms of a lot of things, be it geopolitical, economic, be it environmental," he said. "I think the: sooner that humanity figures that out and comes to terms with that, we'll start working


together even more." The movie's makers say they used worldclass athletes rather than stunt doubles in and learned to surf from a young age, also took part in snowboarding and rock-climbing - including a sequence on Venezuela's Angel Falls, the world's tallest waterfall. "It's a kilometer above the Earth, and that had me hanging off Angel Falls looking down, telling them to turn on the cameras in case I fell so at least it was on camera," he said. The movie opens in China on Friday, three weeks before the US, showing how the Chinese moviegoing market, on course to surpass the US as the biggest, is increasingly important to global blockbusters. Hollywood has been increasingly chasing the rapidly growing Chinese market as box office receipts fall at home. Box office revenue in China last year was \$4.9 billion, almost three times as much as 2010. — AP

Drake is Spotify's most streamed artist of the year globally

potify users are clearly listening to Drake. The rapper was the most streamed artist of the year globally. Spotify announced its end-of-the-year list yesterday and said Drake earned 1.8 billion streams in 2015. Rihanna was the year's most streamed female performer with 1 billion streams, while Major Lazer's ubiquitous hit, "Lean On," was the most streamed song of the year with 540 million streams.

The Weeknd's breakout album, "Beautify Behind the Madness," was the most streamed album of the year, beating Drake's "If You're Reading This It's Too Late," which was No. 2. Ed Sheeran, who was the top streaming artist last year, was second behind Drake. The Weeknd, Maroon 5 and

Kanye West rounded out the top five. In the United States, Drake topped the list of most streamed artists, followed by the Weeknd, West, Sheeran and Eminem. Drake's "If You're Reading This" also topped the US albums list, while Fetty Wap's "Trap Queen" was the most streamed song in America. In Spotify's all-time lists, Sheeran is the most streamed act with more than 3 billion streams; Justin Bieber has the record for most streams in a day with 36 million streams; and Major Lazer's "Lean On," which features MO and DJ Snake, is the leading song. — AP

Postage stamps exhibition narrates Lebanon's history

■he Central Bank of Lebanon launched an exhibition of more than 3,000 postage stamps narrating the history of Lebanon and captured prominent international and regional events. The exhibition offered stamps on 120 panels according to their historical sequence of issuance starting from the end of the Ottoman Empire rule in Lebanon between

1885 and 1918 and then the French military rule stage between 1918 and 1920.

Moreover, the exhibition included stamps from The state of Greater Lebanon and the establishment of the Republic under the French mandate, while the stamps issued after Lebanon's independence in 1943 were divided in accordance with the heads of the Republic.

The stamps collection recorded major events including the United Nations Charter with the Arab League and the Arab Summit Conferences in Beirut in 1956 and 2002, in addition to stamps issued in cultural, artistic and sport occasions and stamps honoring historical figures from Lebanon and the world. — KUNA



fter reverting to type last year with scantily clad models in patent leather, Pirelli has chosen Annie Leibovitz to phoatograph women of all types and from across industry for its 2016 calendar. Tennis player Serena Williams, comedian Amy Schumer, artist Yoko Ono, singer Patti Smith, blogger Tavi Gevinson and model Natalia Vodianova all feature, some wear-

ing more clothes than others. The calendar, produced in book format, is traditionally published in a limited run for top Pirelli clients. The 2016 edition will be its 43rd. "It was really Pirelli that wanted a change and I didn't believe them ... But then once I started taking these pictures it wasn't really like we were doing the Pirelli calendar," Leibovitz said at the calendar's London launch on Monday night. "We were just taking these portraits of incredible, smart, creative, great women and it just started," she told Reuters. Leibovitz also shot the 2000 Pirelli calendar. — Reuters

'SPOTLIGHT' NAMED BEST FEATURE AT 2015 GOTHAM AWARDS

potlight" was named best feature at the 2015 Gotham Awards, capping an evening of wins that also included the award for screenplay and a previously announced special jury prize for its acting ensemble. Actress Bel Powley beat out heavyweight competition-including Cate Blanchett, Blythe Danner and Lily Tomlin-to win the award for best actress, picking up the trophy for her work in "The Diary of a Teenage Girl," while Paul Dano snagged best actor for his work in "Love & amp; Mercy." The Gothams also singled out "Mr Robot" as the winner of its award for breakthrough longform series.

The Gotham Awards mark the start of film industry's awards season with a Nov 30 ceremony in New York, honoring winners drawn from a pool of independent contenders including "The Diary of a Teenage Girl," which earned four nominations, as well as "Carol" and "Tangerine," which picked up three apiece. Hosted by the "Broad City" duo of Ilana Glazer and Abbi Jacobson, the evening also included the inaugural winners in new serialized content categories, which encompassed nominees from TV and digital.

"Spotlight" picked up the award for screenplay, snagging the trophy for Tom McCarthy, who also directed, and Josh Singer. The film went into the ceremony with one award already under its belt, having been the recipient of a previously announced special jury award for its acting ensemble, which includes Mark Ruffalo, Michael Keaton, Rachel McAdams, Liev Schreiber, John Slattery, Stanley Tucci, Billy Crudup and Brian D'Arcy James.

The whole crew showed up to collect the award. "To get one actor to give an ego-sublimated, selfless performance is an achievement," Ruffalo said. "To get a whole group of actors do it together is a frickin' miracle!" "Tangerine" won the audience award at the 2015 Gotham Awards, with the film snagging that award soon after its win for the breakthrough actor award for star Mya Taylor.Broadcast live streaming video on Ustream Taylor wasn't there to accept her award (she'd missed a flight), but "Tangerine" director Sean Baker spoke on behalf of the trans actress. "My hope is that the industry embraces Mya and embraces Kiki," he said from the podium, referring also to Taylor's co-star, Kitana Kiki Rodriguez. "They've also proven there's trans talent out there, it's just up to us to look, and up to us to cast."

Nadia Manzoor and Radhka Vaz's indie web series "Shugs and Fats" picked up the 2015 Gotham Award for breakthrough shortform series, becoming one of the first winners of the independent film awards' new honors for serialized content. Joshua Oppenheimer's "The Look of Silence" won the honor for best documentary.

Glazer and Jacobson kicked off the ceremony with a little gentle ribbing of the Gothams, which earned a few jabs for a lineup of nominees full of dark subject matter. "You know what's not too dark? The nominees for best actor and best actress," Jacobson cracked. "That's right. Eleven white people!" Glazer added.





Tokyo noodle shop awarded world's first ramen Michelin star

tiny Tokyo noodle shop joined the ranks of the world's top restaurants yesterday as it scooped up a star from the respected Michelin Guide. The food bible gave a nod to nine-seat Tsuta-a first for a ramen eatery as Tokyo also kept its title as the world's culinary capital with the most Michelin-starred restaurants. Ramen is one of the most common fast foods in Japan and small shops serving the soup-and-noodle concoction can be found on almost every corner.

In recent years, the dish's popularity has exploded with restau-

rants popping up in major cities around the world, from Hong Kong to New York. Tsuta-which sells bowls from \$7 to \$9.75 apiece at its shop in the north Tokyo neighborhood of Sugamo-features gourmet offerings such as rosemary-flavored barbecued pork and soy sauce ramen with a hint of porcini mushroom.

"The most important thing is that customers like our ramen," Takatoshi Itami, one of the restaurant's cooks, said yesterday. "We have good reviews thanks to them-getting a star was not our priority." The guide, released yesterday, listed 27 other Tokyo ramen

shops as Bib Gourmand, a notch below its three-tiered star system. While sophisticated, high-end Japanese restaurants including sushi and tempura venues, are no strangers to Michelin stars, it is rare for casual eateries to receive the award. The latest Tokyo guide gave its coveted three-star rating to 13 restaurants, with two stars awarded to 51 restaurants and another 153 restaurants receiving one star. — AFP

Ferguson said Letterman plans to donate Emmy Awards, a talkshow set, props and other items to create "The David Letterman Experience" at the Muncie school.

Letterman graduated from Ball State in 1969 and has since returned to the school for a lecture series with other celebrities. He shared the stage at Emens Auditorium with Oprah Winfrey in 2012, Rachel Maddow in 2011 and Twitter co-founder Biz Stone in 2010. — AP

High-tech Barbie stokes privacy fears

he new Barbie doll is "intelligent" and connected. Too connected for some privacy activists. The high-tech "Hello Barbie" doll unveiled earlier this year by toy giant Mattel and likely to be a holiday hit allows children to speak and get a response from their favorite toy. But to make that happen, conversations travel over Wi-Fi networks to Internet "cloud" servers that use artificial intelligence to deliver a per-

For the activist group Campaign for a Commercial-Free Childhood, the privacy risks of the intelligent Barbie outweigh the benefits. "Children confide in dolls and reveal intimate details about their lives, but Hello Barbie won't keep those secrets," the group said in a statement. "When Barbie's belt buckle is held down, everything your child says is transmitted to cloud servers, where it will be stored and analyzed by ToyTalk, Mattel's technology partner.

"Employees of ToyTalk and their partner corporations listen to recordings of children's conversations-and ToyTalk won't even say who their partners are." The consumer group says the new Barbie could become a marketing tool even though the makers have pledged not to do that. And it argues that the high-tech toy could undermine creativity. "Children should use their own initiative and creativity to hold conversations with a doll, impart a personality and build their relationships," the statement said." With Hello Barbie, Mattel and ToyTalk's programmers and algorithms drive the conversation, undermining the creative play that is so critical to children's development." To make matters worse, the organization says Hello Barbie "could be a tempting target for hackers, who could access data stored by your family on home devices and networks through the doll."

The group is urging parents to shun the new doll and earlier this month launched an online campaign with the hashtag #HellNoBarbie. Mattel did not respond to requests for comment. But ToyTalk pointed in a blog post last week to the "many safety features that have been integrated" into the design of Hello Barbie." We are not aware of anyone who has been able to access your WiFi passwords or your kid's audio data," the company said. ToyTalk says passwords are stored in a hardware-encrypted section of the doll, and no conversation history is stored on the toy. It added that stored data "is never used for advertising purposes" and that the doll has been certified as compliant with the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act. To address security concerns, Mattel and ToyTalk have launch a "bug bounty program," where security researchers are rewarded for responsibly disclosing potential vulnerabilities. —AFP
