THE APPEALS COURT OVERTURNS EX-MP'S CITIZENSHIP VERDICT

KUWAIT: The Appeals Court yesterday overturned a Lower Court verdict in which it ordered the government to return citizenship to a former Islamist MP and ruled that it was not competent under the law to handle sovereign issues like citizenship. Earlier this year, the Lower Court ruled that the government's revoking of former MP Abdullah Al-Barghash citizenship along with 56 members of his family, was illegal and ordered the government to reinstate all citizenships.

The government took the action last year as part of a crackdown on the opposition but based its decision on an article in the nationality law which speaks about cheating in obtaining the nationality. The government challenged the Lower Court ruling in the Appeals Court and insisted that courts have no power on the so-called sovereign issues like nationality under the Kuwaiti law. The Appeals Court accepted the government argument and said that the law clearly stipulates that the court have no jurisdiction over nationality law and accordingly cancelled the Lower Court decision.

SOCHI: His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah held official talks with Russian President Vladimir Putin at the presidential palace in the Russian city of Sochi. During the talks, His Highness the Amir offered heartfelt and sincere condolences to the Russian president over the victims of the recent Russian passenger plane crash in Egypt's Sinai. The talks focused on ways and means of promoting existing cooperation between Kuwait and Russia in economic, investment, oil and military cooperation, reflecting the depth of friendship and size of mutual interests between both sides.

Also discussed during the talks were ways of developing distinguished relations between both friendly countries in all fields, and the latest regional and international developments, primarily the Middle East and anti-terrorism efforts. The talks were held in a friendly manner that reflected mutual understanding and friendship, with both sides voicing willingness to develop bilateral relations up to the level that fulfills the ambitions of both friendly peoples and their aspired goals

Meanwhile, Kuwait and Russia yesterday signed a host of bilateral agreements. The signing ceremony, held at the presidential palace in the Russian city of Sochi, was attended by His Highness the Amir and President Vladimir Putin. These include an agreement between the two governments for the exemption of entry visa for holders of diplomatic, special and service passports, signed by First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah and his Russian counterpart Sergey Lavrov.

IFC FORUM FOR GLOBAL DIALOGUE FOR SUSTAINED GROWTH OF ISLAMIC FINANCE: CBK GOVERNOR

KUWAIT: Governor of the Central Bank of Kuwait (CBK) Mohammad Yousef Al-Hashel said the Islamic Finance Conference (IFC) to be hosted by Kuwait today can provide a forum for global forum to develop a vision for the sustained growth of the Islamic financial industry.

The conference will build a platform for continued work in order to further cultivate and exploit the core competencies of Islamic Finance that make sustainable growth possible, he said in an interview with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) published on its website yesterday.

Although still a comparatively small share of all global financial assets, the role and relevance of Islamic finance in the global financial system is gaining significance, he added. He noted that the first theme concerns increasing financial inclusion through access to finance, which is vital in stimulating the economy and improving the welfare of the underprivileged, adding research suggests that over one third of the world's adult population-about 2.5 billion people-lacks access to formal financial services.

Islamic finance can help remedy this situation by promoting Islamic microfinance, financing to small and medium-sized enterprises, and micro Takaful (pooled insurance where shareholders contribute money to protect against loss or damage), he said, indicating that nevertheless, financial inclusion also requires enhancing access to basic banking services, creating a conducive regulatory environment, and promoting public awareness on financial matters.

Financial stability

He further said second, we will discuss how to strengthen regulation and supervision to foster financial stability, elaborating a recent IMF study noted that Islamic standard setters, including the Islamic Financial Services Board, have established "rules of the road," but these are not being applied consistently, potentially stifling the development of Islamic finance and creating systemic vulnerabilities.

He added that continued efforts are needed to refine regulatory frameworks for Islamic finance institutions-in line with recent recommendations of both the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision and the Islamic Financial Services Board-while ensuring greater consistency in their application.

The governor said the third theme will cover the development of Sukuk (the Islamic equivalent of bonds) and other long-term Islamic finance instruments for infrastructure financing and sustainable development.

Sukuk have the potential to serve as high quality liquid assets, which is of increasing importance to regulators in the implementation of Basel III liquidity and capital adequacy frameworks, he said, noting but developing the Sukuk market requires further improvements to legal, regulatory, and disclosure norms, and stronger market infrastructure-including developing the secondary market.

Asked about the success factors that have led to the recent growth of Islamic finance, Al-Hashel said the key success factors anchoring the recent growth of Islamic finance have evolved over time and, to a certain extent, have changed the landscape of the industry.

He added there are many main reasons for the success: First, the characteristics of Islamic finance - such as the concept of sharing profit and loss, investments that are socially responsible and environmentally sustainable, and linking finance with real economic activities - have grown in popularity since the global financial crisis of 2008, and provide an alternative to more traditional financial products.

Among the reasons is the demand for shariacompliant financial services and products (retail, corporate), or for building infrastructure projects, in both Islamic and non-Islamic countries, has been on the rise, resulting in a large number of institutions entering the Islamic finance field for the first time, he said, referring that some of these institutions have been conventional banks eager to capture a share of a promising market through their Islamic window operations.

The third reason is the development of a broad range of innovative products and instruments by Islamic financial institutions, he stated, indicating such innovation has provided additional services to clients, but has also brought some added challenges to those institutions, as well as to their supervisors.

He said the fourth is the availability of a conducive regulatory framework and enabling infrastructure has been a key factor in the development of Islamic finance, adding this factor is prevalent in many countries where legal and regulatory amendments have been undertaken to accommodate Islamic finance.

Challenges ahead

Despite these positive developments, Islamic finance is still fragmented and many challenges lie ahead, Hashel said, adding it remains to be

seen whether the past successes can be sustained, particularly in light of the recent decline in oil prices. Continued innovation and the collective effort of all stakeholders will be required to ensure sustainable growth and success going forward, he said.

Concerning key challenges facing Islamic finance, Hashel said there are two interrelated challenges: one related to market development; and the other, establishing robust supervisory and regulatory frameworks.

With regards to market development, despite the notable strides that have been made, market penetration remains low - with Islamic financial assets accounting for only 1 percent of global financial assets, he explained.

Further, the structure of the Islamic finance industry is still very bank-centric and concentrated in a few countries, he noted. "In addition, we face two types of regulatory and supervisory challenges. The first relates to the foundation of Islamic finance, including ensuring an enabling supervisory, regulatory and legal environment; a suitable accounting and auditing framework; supportive financial market infrastructure; and, capacity building. Addressing these is a pre-requisite for the successful development of Islamic finance," he said.

"We also face a number of regulatory challenges that are more evolving in nature, such as ensuring a level playing field for Islamic finance; implementing Basel III reforms; complementing micro with macro-prudential regulations; cross-sector and cross-border supervision; and safety nets and resolution regimes," he pointed out.

All the stakeholders, including Islamic financial institutions and regulators, are well aware of the ongoing challenges and of the need to address them, he stated. "However, we should keep in mind that improving market development and regulatory regimes are continuous

processes in the context of changing industry needs and macroeconomic and demographic environments," he said.

Asked about the role of IMF with respect to Islamic finance, he said "the IMF has long been involved in Islamic finance. It has played a key role in the establishment of the Islamic Financial Services Board". The establishment of an Interdepartmental Working Group for Islamic finance also demonstrates the IMF's recognition of the importance of Islamic finance for many of its members, including the broader financial stability implications, he mentioned.

Critical role

"While the IMF has made many contributions to Islamic finance, I believe, that it can endeavor to play an even more critical role for Islamic finance in the following areas:

"Providing policy advice and capacity building in a broad range of areas. Technical assistance and training can help countries strengthen the regulation and supervision of their Islamic financial institutions, and develop domestic Sukuk markets. This engagement could usefully focus on providing a set of key regulatory practices, in areas such as liquidity and Shari'ah governance, with a view to achieving further convergence.

"Promoting further integration of Islamic finance with international financial standards to foster financial stability and improve prudential regulations across jurisdictions, including in the context of the IMF's annual economic consultations and Financial Sector Assessment Programs (FSAPs). In this respect, the IMF might wish to take into account the implications of Islamic finance for those members where Islamic finance is growing in significance.

"Facilitating the assessment of the regulation and supervision of the Islamic banking sector using the Islamic Financial Services Board Core Principles for Islamic Finance Regulation. These principles are aimed at providing a framework for the assessment of the quality of the regulatory and supervisory framework for the Islamic banking industry," he said.

As for Islamic finance in Kuwait, Hashel said Kuwait has a bank-centric financial system, with the banking sector accounting for about 84 percent of the domestic financial sector. The Central Bank of Kuwait has also played a vital role in the establishment of the Islamic Financial Services Board (IFSB) and the International Islamic Liquidity Management Corporation (IILM)- as it was a founding member of both institutions, he explained.

Further, the Central Bank continues to play an active role through its membership in the board of directors and participation in working groups and technical committees using its extensive experience to contribute to the development of Islamic markets and regulatory frameworks, he said.

He said the growth in market demand for Islamic finance has been accommodated by establishing appropriate regulatory policies, noting in 2003, the Central Bank of Kuwait promoted a legislative framework by adding a special section to existing Law No. 32 of 1968, to establish prudent regulatory and supervisory policies and procedures for Islamic finance.

This reflects "our view that Islamic banks, while being unique in their structure, remain an integral part of the financial industry, and that their services need to be regulated under one supervisory umbrella", he made clear.

The legislation has allowed "our Bank to formally develop prudential regulations for Islamic banks that are consistent with, and drawn from, the work of the Basel Committee on Banking Supervision and the Islamic Financial Services Board, he said. Doing so has established a level playing field for Islamic and conventional banks, while facilitating the development of more Islamic banks on a coherent and sustainable basis, he concluded. —KUNA

KUWAIT HAS POTENTIALS TO BECOME HUB OF ISLAMIC FINANCE: EXPERT

BRUSSELS: There is currently a tremendous opportunity for Kuwait to profile itself as a hub for Islamic finance and Islamic banking, according to a prominent expert. Professor Laurent Marliere, head of ISFIN, the world's leading advisory for the Islamic Markets, said that Kuwait has "a wonderful card to play" and that the Global Conference organized by Central Bank of Kuwait on November 11 in Kuwait can define the guidelines towards this goal. "With the new vision of the Central Bank, Kuwait could take a challengers position in the region and benefit from the numerous advantages of the country to pioneer new ways of conceiving Islamic finance. It comes at an appropriate time as Islamic finance itself is being challenged to redefine its model, not to mimic conventional finance," he told the Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) in an interview.

"There are great expectations around the globe concerning Islamic finance and Islamic banking, which is discipline that does not belong to the Muslims exclusively but has turned into a global phenomenon. The participation of the IMF is a strong sign of the value of the event," said the Belgian expert on global economics and finance.

He said that historically "Kuwait is actually a pioneer in Islamic banking, " noting that Islamic banking institutions in Kuwait are regulated by the Central Bank of Kuwait, established in 1968 under the Central Bank of Kuwait Law (CBK).

CBK Law provides for the Islamic banking regulatory and supervisory framework and sets the requirement for the Shariah Governance framework. "This means that the legal framework is ready to enhance banking activities including the ones recognized by customary practices and the Shariah law compliance. The country's Islamic banking industry is set to embark on the market without being hindered by substantial legislative formalities. A lot of time can be gained using pre-existing legislation," explained Marliere.

He said that the real challenge is to tap into the Islamic Economy and the Halal industry. "Islamic Finance is just one chapter of the Islamic Economy which should act as support to the full-fledged economy. After the 2008 recession, people are

aware that growth is not a one-way street and the shrinking oil prices are a second reminder," he said.

"After the first Blessing of Oil, Kuwait could find in Islamic Finance and the Islamic Economy a second blessing. With oil prices going down, it is the moment to invest carefully its sovereign and corporate resources into the right markets and seize the opportunity. It takes vision and power to achieve this," opined the expert on Islamic markets.

He noted that "Islamic Finance in Kuwait relies heavily on the domestic retail sector, saving and consumer lending market in the country. That is not going to be enough. Islamic Finance industry in Kuwait needs to target and work outside Kuwait.

He said that "unfortunately most of the Islamic Banks and finance companies focus entirely on the local market. If this sector wants to grow they have to compete in global markets. But, more companies are now coming into the Kuwaiti market targeting the same retail segment," said the Belgian academic. "It is clear that the Islamic Finance sector is not growing as much as we had expected. On a global level, the Islamic Finance sector is growing, but the size of the sector is very small," he added.

Brussels-based ISFIN is considered as the world's leading platform of advisory firms specializing in Islamic Finance, investments from and to the Muslim world and the Halal industry. The alliance covers more than 60 jurisdictions around the world. —KUNA

Three women killed in horrific crash

KUWAIT: Three women were killed in an accident at the King Fahad Road which left their car cut into three pieces from the severity of the impact. Preliminary investigations indicate that the car was driving at high speed when the driver lost control and it crashed right into a light post, ripping it into pieces. The three victims are Kuwaiti aged 25, 19 and 18. Police, paramedics and fire department officers dealt with the case. An investigation was opened to determine the circumstances behind the accident.

18,000 liquor bottles

Shuwaikh customs officers foiled an attempt to smuggle liquor into Kuwait, as thousands of bottles were found hidden in car tires in a shipment that arrived from the United Arab Emirates. The shipment was initially estimated to contain around 5,000 bottles at a value of KD 250 thousand, but later estimations revealed that it contained nearly 18,000 in six containers. A prime suspect has reportedly been identified.

Truck accident

A truck transporting nitrogen near North Shuaiba Port's gate flipped over, prompting Ahmadi fire center men to respond. The truck was moved to another carrier. No injuries were reported.

Driver unharmed

A car fell into a hole in a gas station in Ishbiliya, prompting Farwaniya fire department to respond. Firemen lifted the car using a hydraulic machine, and managed to get it out of the hole without harming the driver. No injuries were reported in the incident.

Armed robbery

A man told Fintas police that he was robbed inside a grocery store. He added that a person carrying an axe entered, headed to the cash register and took KD 500 before escaping. Investigations are ongoing.

Drug possession

Ahmadi police arrested two men with possession of drugs. A security source said patrol officers saw a car in the parking lot of a mosque and became suspicious, so they asked for the IDs of the two persons inside. Then, they searched them and found 60 brown tablets in one man's, in addition to one blue tablet as well as KD 718. One of them was also found to be wanted for failure to pay KD 424 to a telephone company.

Ahmadi arrests

Police arrested a man with 20 bottles suspected of containing liquor in Ahmadi. Meanwhile, Ahmadi police arrested a man under the influence of drugs, and was found with possession of drugs. A security source said that patrol officers caught a citizen with possession of a black bag containing a green substance mixed with a crystalline white material suspected of being drugs. He was sent to the Drug Control General Department (DCGD).

Traffic statistics

Traffic department statistics during the first week of November indicated that 2,065 cars and 44 motorcycles were impounded, while 95 persons were detained for committing violations including crossing red lights, overspeeding, recklessness, and not having a driving license. DASMAN DIABETES INSTITUTE HOLDS WORLD DIABETES DAY 2015 CELEBRATION



MABANEE SAYS SAUDI UNIT GETS NOD FOR \$1.9 BLN RIYADH SHOPPING COMPLEX

DUBAI: A subsidiary of Kuwaiti developer Mabanee has received approval to build a 7 billion riyal (\$1.9 bln) retail, residential and commercial complex in Saudi Arabia's capital Riyadh, the parent firm said yesterday.

Shumoul Holding Co, 55-percent owned by Mabanee, will begin work on the 1.7 million-square-meter project in the next few months, according to a statement to the Kuwait stock exchange. The Avenues Riyadh will include a shopping mall, plus residential and office units and has now been approved by the city's authorities, the statement said.

Mabanee expects the project to be completed in 2019, but did not say how it would be funded. However, its 2014 annual report states it incurred costs of 106 million Kuwaiti dinars (\$349 mln) that year to buy the land for The Avenues Riyadh and conduct some work on the scheme. Mabanee has interests in real estate, construction and investments. — Reuters

KUWAIT TO CRACK DOWN ON INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY THEFT


KUWAIT: The Ministry of Commerce and Industry is seeking to lift Kuwait's international rating in combating intellectual rights' crimes through bolstering cooperation with various states and specialized organizations, a ministry official said yesterday. Sheikh Nimer Al-Sabah, the assistant undersecretary for international organizations' affairs and external trade, said in a statement a recent meeting that grouped Kuwaiti officials with specialists from the Arab states regional bureau of the Committee on Development and Intellectual Property (CDIP) discussed "inauguration of the second phase for overhauling the intellectual property sector in the State of Kuwait."

The meeting which involved officials

from the Ministry of Commerce and Industry tackled technical aid that could be provided by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) to the member states.

WIPO has recently set up a data base for the trademarks bureau, the patents and industrial samples at the ministry, he said, indicating that the organization is ready to take follow-up steps to overhaul the trade sector in tune with Kuwait's international obligations.

Kuwait was among the first Arab states that had joined the WIPO. It officially signed the WIPO treaty in April 1998. Since then, it has adopted a series of international accords in the same sector. — KUNA

WIFE STABBED IN DOMESTIC DISPUTE

KUWAIT: A man stabbed his wife during to domestic dispute in Rabiya, according to police. Local police station officers were approached by a bedoon woman who said that her husband, Kuwaiti, stabbed her. She handed them a medical report documenting the injury she sustained as a result of the stabbing. Police are investigating. Separately, a woman called police saying that her husband threatened to kill her, and filed a complaint against him. The woman, Kuwaiti, went to Waha police station and said that she received insulting messages and a murder threat from her husband's phone number. Investigations are ongoing in the case.

Neighbors row

A woman accused her two neighbors of insulting and attempting to beat her when she scolded them for gossiping about her behind her back. A security source said a citizen went to Salmiya police station and told them that she had a dispute with her neighbors who reportedly talked negatively about her behind her back. When she confronted them for what they did, they insulted her in front of their building's residents, and where about to beat her before residents rescued her, she said. Investigations are underway.

Damaged cars

A female driver drove in the wrong direction in Abdallah Al-Mubarak area and collided with three cars in the process. A security source said police went to the site and found out that a woman was driving in the wrong way and damaged three vehicles. Police took the driver to the police station, where a case was filed.

Home robbery

Investigations are ongoing to identify and arrest a man who reportedly broke into a Maidan Hawally apartment and robbed its contents. The tenant, Syrian, told officers that she returned home to find out that the door was broken. When she went inside, she discovered that gold rings and cash were missing. Crime scene investigators went to the apartment to collect evidence. —Al-Rai

Car stolen

A man hung on his car when a thief stole it and dragged him several meters. He suffered several bruises and scratches as a result, while the suspect escaped. A security source said the man, Egyptian, who works as a delivery man, was in Ardhiya when he left his car briefly with the engine running. Suddenly, he saw a person getting inside the car but before he drove away, the man hung on it. Detectives are working on the case.

NEW MECHANISM FOR GOV'T PROJECTS' **WORK PERMITS**

KUWAIT: A team from the Manpower Public Authority led by Director Ahmad Al-Moussa recently met with bodies concerned with government contracts in order to set a new mechanism to issue work permits for laborers work ing in governmental projects, said informed sources.

The sources explained that the new mechanism adopts issuing those work permits gradually according to the project's phases and the type of labor needed for each phase. The sources added that the number of laborers needed in each phase would be determined by the body responsible for the project, not the company executing it. "Governmental bodies and the Central Tenders Committee will also be automatically connected to monitor and follow up the workers registered on each project," explained the sources, noting that work permits for laborers needed in each phase would not be issued unless the previous one was concluded. Finally, the sources expected another similar meeting to be held by the end of this week to approve the new mechanism and issue its execution decision. — Al-Anbaa

WHERE ARE YOU **DINING TONIGHT?!**

am not going to talk about the 'brooms' battle at Shuwaikh industrial area, the Ardhiya scuffle nor the Hawalli murder and the disastrous aftermath of each of these incidents in addition to the consequences that made some people dare criticize Kuwait and instigate law violation, which were handled by the interior ministry according to law to maintain law and

What I am talking about are the statements made by an official who is supposed to be careful about the words he uses in addressing the public, because he knows that he would be accountable for each word he says, as such statements are usually deemed reflecting official viewpoints when made through an official media channel. The mistake was great especially since neither the official nor the ministry he represents did anything to reduce the impact of such statements and avoid the bad image about the policies that ministry adapts in dealing with expatriates.

Speaking to Kuwait TV channel about residency laws and expats residing in Kuwait, the official made major mistakes while talking about them expressing his own personal view point. He said that there is a large number of the expats living in Kuwait without the state having any need for them. Well, I might agree to that. Yet, along with so many citizens, I strongly disagree with degrading and insulting expats, let alone that insult coming from an official.

That official reviewed the luxuries expats enjoy by living in Kuwait, claiming that they receive free services. He even claimed that they get free dinners by swarming to wedding halls to enjoy various buffets there. Furthermore, he talked about services the ministry he represents does not provide and he knows nothing about, that is health services. He also deduced that all expat males have their wives work to earn more money 'Mashallah,' as he said. In short, this official made himself a judge and accordingly made a study to increase the fees expats pay, ending the 'free' services he believes they get. He argued that other GCC states 'milk down' expats making them reach a 'minus' state in terms of monthly wages by the end of each month, while expats in Kuwait spend nothing.

I believe that the official's statements about expats were way beyond rational official ones. Did he in person study the numbers of expats flocking to wedding halls to dine for free? How many expats can dine for free if we know that 3 million expats live in Kuwait? Does Kuwait actually include all that number of wedding halls? These are mere rhetoric inquiries to refute the official's statement concerning free dinners.

In addition, do all expats, half or even one quarter of them need meticulous careful health care involving radiology and tests that cost the state millions of dinars? Then, what about the hundreds of millions, or even up to one billion Kuwaiti dinars, the state has so far collected from health insurance imposed on expats and the loss of considerable sums of those into the pockets of influential tycoons and the health ministry's helplessness to get them back? What happened to the health insurance hospitals they were to be built by those millions and allocated for expats, especially since the health ministry approved building three of them, but they only remained in blueprints?

I believe, and many citizens agree with me, that the official was absolutely wrong and abusive in what he said about expats who contribute to developing Kuwait. if 'His Excellency' had seen one, two or ten expats seeking free dinner outside a wedding hall, that does not mean that all expats dine freely. If expats living in other GCC states reach a 'minus' budget by the end of the month, so many of them reach that state before the 15th of each month here in Kuwait!

You are an official and have the right to make any decision and impose any fees you see fit in your line of work because that is part of your job's duties, and your seniors are the only ones who decide to approve or reject what you propose. Yet, you have no right to slander large numbers of people living with us and coserving our country with us. we do hope you would reconsider what you said and explain yourself in a way that respects the dignity of so many expats who were offended by what you said. We also hope the interior minister would say some good word about this issue because expats are used to that from him!

RUSSIA SEES POSSIBLE 'TERROR' LINK IN JET CRASH

a terrorist attack could have caused last month's Russian plane crash in Egypt, as thousands more tourists were evacuated from the country. Britain and the United States, as well as international investigators, suspect a bomb exploded on board the Metrojet A-321 plane, but Egyptian officials insist there is no evidence yet of an attack on the aircraft which jihadists claim to have downed.

Russia had also previously refrained from blaming the crash, which killed all 224 people on board, on terrorists until Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev's admission. "The possibility of an act of terror is of course there as the reason for what happened," Medvedev said in an interview with Rossiyskaya Gazeta state newspaper. A growing international chorus has backed the theory that the plane was downed in an attack, with British Foreign Minister Philip Hammond saying Monday it was "more likely than not" that the plane was downed by an "explosive device placed on

SHARM EL SHEIKH: Moscow has acknowledged for the first time board". On Monday, Israel-which has strong intelligence links to neighboring Sinai where the Airbus came down while en route from Egypt's resort of Sharm El-Sheikh to Saint Petersburg-joined in. "There is a strong probability that this is an attack," Defense Minister Moshe Yaalon told Israeli reporters on Monday. And Airbus chief Fabrice Bregier said no technical fault has yet been detected for the crash of the A-321. "I can say that so far, what we got from the investigation didn't trigger any action, technical action on our side, regarding the A-321 fleet," said Bregier. "But we need to wait for the conclusion of the investigations."

Sources close to the probe have told AFP that experts involved in the investigation, with the exception of the Egyptians, "strongly favor" the theory of a bomb on board. Egypt has pushed back against mounting international concerns that a bomb brought down the plane, with Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry saying it was too early to form a "hypothesis".

IS operative killed

Amid the tourist exodus from Egypt, a senior operative of the Islamic State jihadist group, Ashraf Ali Ali Hassanein al-Gharabli, was shot dead in an exchange of fire in Cairo after police tried to arrest him, the interior ministry said. The IS group's branch in the Sinai claimed responsibility after the Russian plane crash. IS said it downed the plane in retaliation for Russian air strikes in Syria, but has not said how. The IS affiliate in Egypt is waging a bloody insurgency in north Sinai that has killed hundreds of policemen and soldiers.

Meanwhile, tens of thousands of foreign tourists, including some 80,000 Russians and 20,000 Britons, were stranded in Egypt after flights were cancelled over security fears. Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday suspended all flights to Egypt. Moscow said Monday that about 25,000 Russian tourists had so far returned on more than 100 flights,

while London said some 5,000 Britons had returned home. Hammond said he hoped flights to Sharm could resume soon, once "robust" security arrangements are in place.

Flight numbers have been limited because both Russia and Britain have banned tourists from bringing their checkin luggage, which will be flown home separately. That restriction has prompted Egypt to limit the number of daily repatriation flights because it says there is only so much baggage its airports can accommodate. The crash has led to calls for greater security at airports in regions near where jihadists operate. It has also raised fears for Egypt's vital tourism industry, which had already been suffering from years of unrest. Local tourism chiefs insist, however, that Sharm is secure. "Sharm is safe. There is no problem inside Sharm El-Sheikh," said Givara El-Gafy, head of the south Sinai tourism chamber. —AFP

TREASURE TROVE OF 'ANCIENT' ARCHAEOLOGY TUCKED AWAY IN GAZA

GAZA: Nafez Abed's cramped workroom is filled with sculptures and mosaics with patterns from the Byzantine, Greek and Roman periods. It is an emporium of Middle Eastern antiquity tucked away in Gaza. And none of it is real. Abed, 55, is a self-taught archaeologist, preserver and restorer who crafts reproductions of ancient pieces he finds or has seen in museums. He gives his work so much authenticity that international experts have been wowed by his

A fair-haired, intense man, he spends almost all his time in his studio, built on the roof of his unfinished house in a refugee camp in northern Gaza. Its windows are covered in plastic to keep out the rain that blows in from the nearby Mediterranean. "The Museum of Mosaics" is written on the wooden door that leads into his workroom. On a large table in the middle of the dark room stands a reproduction of a statue of Alexander the Great, looking as if it truly dated from 300 BC, amid oil-fired lamps and copies of coins dating back more than 2,500 years.

"My fixation with archaeology runs in my veins," said the father of seven, who trained as a blacksmith before deciding 30 years ago to dedicate himself to a more refined art. "I spend more than 10 hours a day here, sitting among my works and reproductions," he said with a sense of wistfulness. His room was lit by one small lamp, plugged into an extension cable that stretches from the floor below. It was

Abed's father who got him started, imbuing him with a love of antiquity and the rich ancient history of Gaza, where the blinded Biblical hero Samson lived.

Over the millennia, Gaza has served as a trading port for ancient Egyptians, Philistines, Romans and Crusaders. Beneath its sands lie ruins from Alexander the Great's siege of the city, Emperor Hadrian's visit, Mongol raids and the arrival of the Islamic armies 1,400 years ago. Napoleon and the Ottomans camped here and British armies passed through in World War I. Abed frequently tours Gaza's beaches looking for ancient remains.

Sometimes he restores pieces he finds and other times he uses the clay in a reproduction, treating the material in such a way that it looks to be centuries old. Via extensive reading on archaeology in Arabic and English, he has developed a range of techniques for restoration and aging. To a visitor's eye, everything looks ancient. "Some clients, some visitors, including scientists who have visited me, thought some of the pieces were real before I told them they were imitations made by own hand," he said.

Museum quality
As his skills grew, he gained wider acclaim.
By presidential decree, he was appointed deputy director of rehabilitation at the Palestinian Ministry of Archaeology in 1995 and he has also been in charge of the mosaic department. He has travelled to Jericho and

Jenin in the West Bank to work with Italian and Dutch experts on archaeological sites there, and made trips to the Louvre in Paris and museums in Arles and Geneva to help with restorations.

In 2005, the head of the Geneva museum visited Gaza with his wife and talked at length with Abed about his skills. "He offered me a job at the museum, but I turned it down," said Abed, making clear his regret. "It was a mistake." In 2007, the Islamist group Hamas seized control of Gaza. Since then, travelling abroad has become much harder and life inside the territory has grown tougher, with restrictions on the import of goods and a series of short wars with Israel. In his studio, Abed works intensely on a range of mosaics. One depicts a beautiful woman riding a charging bull, a copy of an original based in Naples, Italy.

Another set of seven mosaics show the ancient gates to Palestine and there are also reproductions of pieces he has seen while visiting the Netherlands and France. Most Gazans cannot afford his works, but Abed has a few local clients, including hotel owners and other wealthy people who want to decorate their homes with ancient-looking artifacts. While that is something, business is not as it once was. "I used to be visited by foreigners, by consuls and ambassadors, by international businessmen and tourists," said Abed. "There are no foreigners nowadays. The situation got

IRAQ PM'S REFORMS HINDERED BY DIVISIONS AMID IS THREATS

BATTLE AGAINST ISLAMIC STATE AT STAKE

BAGHDAD: Facing resistance from within his own party, Iraqi Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi is struggling to sustain support for a political shake-up he says is critical to efforts to counter Islamic State militants. In an attempt to regain momentum after parliament last week blocked his government from passing important reforms without its approval, Abadi reached out over the weekend to Iraq's powerful Shi'ite Muslim establishment, which has previously backed his anti-corruption

But he returned from meetings with senior clerics in the sacred Shiite city of Najaf without securing fresh support, raising the prospect of further isolation as he seeks to head off the threat of a no confidence vote by disgruntled lawmakers. In Najaf, Abadi notably did not meet with Iraq's top Shiite religious figure, Grand Ayatollah Ali Al-Sistani. Sistani and the other clerics have backed Abadi but seem to have become impatient with the slow pace of reform. "It's as though he is walking through a minefield," said Baghdadbased political analyst Ahmed Younis, citing pressures from parliament, the public, and Shiite religious authorities. "He is now obligated to work in a way that pleases all sides."

History suggests he should proceed with caution. Abadi's predecessor, Nuri Al-Maliki, was also perceived as a leader who did not consult before taking decisions. He was pushed out last summer after alienating his own party and fellow Shiites, as well as American allies and regional power Iran, which has wide sway in Iraq. Iraq's power

brokers, including the Shiite religious establishment, supported Abadi as the new prime minister after concluding he was a consensus builder who had a chance of healing political and sectarized divisions.

The biggest challenge for Abadi is reforming Iraq's notoriously corrupt military — which has largely collapsed in the face of Islamic State advances-and streamlining a government seen as inept. Emboldened by popular protests in Baghdad and other cities and a call for action by Sistani, Abadi unilaterally launched a reform campaign in August. He moved to dismantle Iraq's patronage system and root out incompetence and corruption undermining the major OPEC oil exporter's battle against Islamic State militants who have seized nearly a third of the country's territory. Those measures soon got bogged down by legal challenges and opposition from entrenched interests. Frustrated by inaction, protesters demanding an end to corruption and better water and electricity services began to call Abadi weak and ineffective. Sistani has also expressed displeasure with delays in enacting reforms, calling on Abadi to take bolder action in the face of resistance. Though the reclusive octogenarian rarely hosts politicians, a meeting in Naiaf would have shored up Abadi against the increasingly popular Iranian-backed Shiite militias and politicians like Maliki, who have sought to maintain privileges targeted by the reforms.

Their aims are causing a split among Iraq's Shiite leaders, further fragmenting a country

struggling to contain Islamic State, the biggest security threat since a US-led invasion toppled autocrat Saddam Hussein in 2003. "It was a setback," Sami Askari, a lawmaker from the ruling State of Law coalition, said of the Najaf trip. "I'm sure Abadi came back unhappy, because if he had been able to see Sistani it would balance all the movement of the parliament." A spokesman for Abadi said no such meeting was ever requested, but a source close to the prime minister described the fact that he did not meet Sistani as "negative"

Faded mandate

With his once indisputable mandate from the protesters and Sistani faded, Abadi may no longer be in a position to challenge those who oppose his reform drive. The toughest demands could come from within his own State of Law coalition, which led last week's vote asserting parliament's authority after it demanded wider consultation from Abadi. While the lawmakers' resistance is focused on the reforms, it stems from larger disagreements between two camps inside State of Law headed, respectively, by Abadi and Maliki.

Maliki's supporters, who are allied with Iran, regard Abadi as too close to the United States, which arms and trains Iraqi forces and is leading an air campaign against Islamic State. Maliki himself is popular with the Iranian-backed militias, seen as a bulwark against the Sunni insurgents. "Abadi sometimes feels that this is a threat to his

authority and he tried hard to weaken Maliki," said Askari. Abadi has failed to enforce one of his main reforms which would have removed Maliki and the two other vice presidents from their positions. Instead Maliki is holding on, setting himself on a collision course with Abadi. "The more (Abadi) pressures Maliki, the more he will lose the support of the State of Law," said Askari.

State of Law members dismiss speculation that Abadi has begun courting outside parties to form a new coalition to support his reforms. They warn such a move would require major concessions and expose him to attacks from his own base. But lawmakers say Abadi may still need broader support to ensure his proposals pass through parliament smoothly and to prevent the possibility of a vote of no confidence, which lawmakers have not ruled out. Backing from Shiite clerics Abadi met over the weekend, who are largely opposed to Maliki, could prove critical in any future confrontation, but this seems unlikely under present circumstances. Meanwhile, backing from other Shiite groups, such as the Sadrists or the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq, would enable Abadi to block a coup from within his own electoral alliance, said the source close to the prime minister. "It's just to make sure that he's got members in parliament that would block any move down the road to withdraw confidence," the source said. "A smattering of support from the Kurds or from a Sunni party means you're making sure they won't reach the 60 percent they need. It's a preemptive motion."— Reuters

Gulf air strikes on Islamic State down due to Yemen

DUBAI: Air strikes by Gulf Arab members of the US-led coalition fighting the Islamic State group in Syria have diminished since they launched an air war against Yemeni rebels in March, a US general said yesterday. Bahrain, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates have carried out air strikes against IS in Syria but the three Gulf Cooperation Council members are also involved in an air and ground campaign in Yemen in support of exiled President Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi. "There is a mix of GCC that is participating in Yemen as well as in the operations in Iraq and Syria," said US Air Forces Central Command chief Lieutenant General Charles Q Brown. "Less so since March because they've been occupied with the Yemen operation," he told reporters at the Dubai Airshow. Washington has been leading mainly Western allies in carrying out air strikes against IS in Iraq since August last year.

US man sentenced for anti-gay slurs

SEATTLE: A Washington state man who yelled anti-gay slurs and threatened to stab three men in a Seattle neighborhood with a sizable gay community has been sentenced to 30 months in prison, the Justice Department said on Monday. Troy Deacon Burns, a 38-year-old from Bremerton, Washington, pleaded guilty on Aug 5, admitting in a plea deal that he attacked three gay men who were walking in the Capitol Hill neighborhood, the department said. During the plea hearing, Burns said he was under the influence of drugs and alcohol at the time of the assault and claimed that he did not remember his actions, the department said. An attorney for Burns could not immediately be reached for comment. He was charged in August under the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr, Hate Crimes Prevention Act, the Justice Department said. Burns, holding a knife raised over his head in a stabbing position, approached the men just after midnight and yelled homophobic slurs. The men ran, but Burns caught up to one and again used a gay slur and threatened to stab him. As the second man helped the first away, their friend found Seattle police officers, who arrested Burns, the depart-

Knife attacks, unrest returns to Jerusalem

JERUSALEM: Alleged Palestinian assailants carried out two knife attacks in Jerusalem yesterday, police said, as a wave of unrest in Israel and the Palestinian territories returned to the city after a lull. In one incident, a Palestinian carried out a knife attack at the Damascus Gate, the main entrance to Jerusalem's Old City, and was "neutralized", police said. In the other, two knife-wielding Palestinian boys aged 12 to 13 attacked a security guard in a settler neighborhood of annexed east Jerusalem, with one shot and wounded and the other arrested, police said. The security guard was wounded and treated at the scene, police spokeswoman Luba Samri said. The attack took place as the guard was on duty on a tram line. After the first suspect was shot, "passengers on the tram rushed to the second terrorist and overcame him," Samri said. While other knife and car-ramming assaults have continued in the occupied West Bank amid a weeks-long surge of violence, Tuesday's attacks were the first in Jerusalem in more than a week.

2 Indians wounded in Saudi region shooting

RIYADH: Two Indians and a Saudi policeman were wounded by gunfire in the east of the kingdom as authorities hunted suspects linked to unrest by minority Shiites, the interior ministry said yesterday. A police traffic patrol "came under heavy fire from a farming area" in the Shiite-populated Qatif district on Monday evening, the ministry's spokesman said. The Indians were passers-by, he said. An Indian embassy official confirmed that two nationals were wounded and are in stable condition. "We are following it up," he said. The ministry spokesman did not identify the perpetrators but warned the public not to provide assistance to people on a list of 23 wanted suspects issued in 2011 after Shiite unrest. Saudi Arabia's Shiite minority, who complain of marginalization in the Sunni-dominated kingdom, began protests that year in Eastern Province, where most of them live. Many suspects on the wanted list have already been detained or killed in shootouts.

TURKEY URGED TO RESUME TALKS WITH REBELS, LIFT MEDIA CURBS

BRUSSELS: The European Commission urged EU candidate Turkey yesterday to lift restrictions on media freedom, respect human rights and relaunch peace talks with Kurdish militants in the violence-racked southeast of the country. In its annual progress report on Turkey, whose decade-long accession talks with the European Union have largely stalled, the Commission also noted with concern President Tayyip Erdogan's push for a constitutional overhaul that would give him much greater powers.

But the EU executive's criticisms were cloaked in diplomatic language, reflecting the political sensitivity of dealing with a large, strategically important country whose cooperation Brussels sorely needs in tackling Europe's migrant crisis. "Turkey needs to move because there are many areas where they need to deal with basic principles, the fundamentals," EU enlargement commissioner Johannes Hahn told the European Parliament, referring to human rights and freedom of expression. The Commission report comes at a difficult time for Turkey, where fighting has resumed between security forces and militants of the Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) after the collapse of a ceasefire. Turks have also just handed Erdogan's AK Party, in power since 2002, a further four years in power in a Nov 1 election that saw a sharp rise in social and political tensions. "The Commission hopes to see an end to the escalating violence in Turkey and the return to negotiations on a lasting solution on the Kurdish issue," said Hahn, an Austrian politician from the centre-right.

As Hahn spoke in Brussels, Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu told state broadcaster TRT his new government would pursue major economic, social and judicial reforms in the next six months, without giving details. He also called for an executive presidential system. Erdogan's critics say his push for a stronger presidency in a country where the head of state has mainly played a more ceremonial role is evidence of his growing authoritarianism.

Migrants

The EU criticism of Turkey and of Erdogan, who served as prime minister for a decade before moving to the presidential palace, has been relatively muted due to the migrant crisis. The progress report, whose publication was delayed until after the election to avoid upsetting Erdogan and the mildly Islamist AK Party, praised Turkey for sheltering millions of refugees fleeing the civil war in neighboring Syria. German Chancellor Angela Merkel, who visited Istanbul before the vote, says there can be no solution to the migration crisis without Turkey, which shares a long border with Syria and Iraq.

The Commission is negotiating a deal for Turkey to absorb more Syrian refugees in return for easier visa access to the EU, cash and an acceleration of membership talks. As well as Turkey, the Balkan countries of Montenegro, Serbia, Macedonia, Bosnia, Albania and Kosovo are all seeking membership of the EU, the world's largest trading bloc. But admitting Turkey, a mainly Muslim nation of 75 million people, has always been much more controversial. — Reuters

NO COUNTRY FOR YOUNG MEN: MALI LOSES ITS YOUTHS TO MIGRANT CRISIS

KODJAN: Once bustling with sinewy young men like any other farming village in rural Mali, Kodjan is starting to look distinctly grey. Little by little, the demographics of the settlement are altering as its youth join the exodus of African migrants looking for a better life in Europe. "My three grandchildren went off in search of adventure in Spain, because here there is nothing," a 72-year-old woman tells AFP in front of her shack. "If they had not gone, we would have died of hunger."

Across the village of around 2,000, some 60 kilometers west of the capital Bamako, the story is the same. An unearthly quiet suffocates the streets lined with straw and mud huts that once rang with the laughter of husbands, sons and fathers. Nearly 140,000 migrants arrived in Italy from Africa by sea in 2015, the bulk of them Eritreans but sizeable numbers from west Africa too, according to International Organization for Migration figures.

The heads of state and government from most of the EU member countries and

more than 30 African nations including Mali are due in the Maltese capital Valletta on Wednesday for talks on tackling Europe's migration crisis. African leaders will be asked to approve an action plan aimed at tackling the root causes of mass migration, according to a draft obtained by AFP. While Eritreans are fleeing a bloody and repressive dictatorship, the exodus from Kodjan, where the local economy is almost entirely reliant on agriculture, is about money.

'Dying of shame'

"At the end of the winter season, there is nothing left to do, and young people would rather leave than remain idle, dying of shame," says farmer Ousmane Diarra. He tells AFP that in every family at least three young men are "on some foreign adventure, earning money for their relatives". Assistant village chief Moussa Diarra, 77, explains the situation to Kodjan's council as he sits in a wooden chair under trees in a yard among chickens pecking for grain and women pounding millet. "The villagers scrape

together the money the young people need to travel," he says.

"Last month for example, we sold an ox and, with the money raised, three young people left." According to the official, young people travel to Mali's cities to look for work and, when they have saved enough, set out across the desert to Libya or Morocco, and onward across the treacherous Mediterranean Sea. "When young people arrive in Europe, this is a really happy event for us here. It solves our problems," says Oumar Diarra, 62, another villager. Nearby, Sika Diarra proudly points out a satellite dish on his roof. "I have a son who is in Spain. It is an adventure. He sends us money and it is thanks to him that we have the satellite dish," he says. "We pray to God that his little brother will also make it to Europe. That's all that can save us.

Nothing else," adds his wife. Nearby, a girl aged 15 with a baby on her back explains anxiously that her husband went to Spain two years ago and she has since heard nothing. — AFP

War on IS needs 'boots on THE GROUND': US AIR FORCE

AT LEAST 22 DEAD IN ATTACK ON SYRIA REGIME BASTION

DUBAI: The air campaign against the Islamic State group has made progress in degrading the jihadist organization but will not be enough without local boots on the ground, the US air force secretary said yesterday. The comments from Deborah Lee James come just days after Pentagon chief Ashton Carter raised the possibility of deploying additional US Special Forces personnel to Syria if more partners can be found among local forces on the ground.

"Air power is extremely important. It can do a lot but it can't do everything," James said. "Ultimately it cannot occupy territory and very importantly it cannot govern territory," she told reporters at the Dubai Airshow. "This is where we need to have boots on the ground. We do need to have ground forces in this campaign." James cited the "Iraqi army, the Free Syrians and the Kurds" as forces to support in the fight against IS.

A US-led coalition has been carrying out air strikes against IS in Iraq and Syria for more than a year in a campaign that has seen the jihadists lose some territory but also make new gains. The White House announced on October 30 that US President Barack Obama had authorized the first sustained deployment of "fewer than 50" special force personnel to Syria, reversing a longstanding refusal to put US boots on the ground.

And in an interview on Sunday, the Pentagon chief said that more US troops could "absolutely" be deployed to Syria if Washington identifies more "capable local forces" as partners in the fight against IS. While US troops are believed to have carried out covert missions in Syria before, they had not previously been deployed there on a continuous basis.

22 dead in attack

In another development, at least 22 people were killed in mortar fire yesterday on Syria's coastal city of Latakia, in one of the bloodiest shellings there since the country's war began, state media reported. The toll rose to "22 people killed and 62 wounded" in the attack on eastern neighborhoods of the regime bastion, state television said. Earlier, state news agency SANA had said 12 people died and 57 were hurt when two mortar rounds struck residential neighborhoods.

Latakia lies in the heartland of the minority Alawite sect to which Syria's ruling clan belongs and has been largely spared attacks during four and a half years of civil war. A rare car bombing in September killed 10 people and wounded dozens in Hamam Square in the provincial capital. Rebels and jihadists, including Al-Qaeda's Syria affiliate, have long targeted the region, in part for its symbolic value as a regime stronghold. According to a Syrian security source yesterday's attack took place near Latakia's Tishreen University, "where many students were gathered". Abir Selman, a 24-year old literature student at the university, said she was waiting for the bus when the mortars struck. "I saw blood everywhere and people running in every direction," she said. "I passed by a corpse that had nothing left except for its legs... We wait at this bus stop every day," Selman added.

Syrian state television broadcast video footage of blood-stained streets littered with broken class and mangled cars. Meanwhile, one person was killed and five wounded in a mortar attack on residential areas of Damascus, state television said. According to the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights at least 10 mortar rounds struck various neighborhoods of the capital. The Britain-based Observatory said another four people, including a child, were killed in government rocket fire on the flashpoint town of Douma, east of Damascus. The toll was likely to rise as some of those wounded were in critical condition, the monitoring group said. Douma lies in the opposition bastion of Eastern Ghouta, which is regularly bombarded by regime forces. Suspected Russian strikes on the town last week killed at least 23 civilians. — Agencies

SHOOTINGS AT MEXICO COCKFIGHT, FIELD KILL 16

ACAPULCO: A weekend of violence killed at least 16 people in Mexico's troubled southern state of Guerrero as shootings erupted at a cockfight and a football field, police said Monday. Twelve people were killed, including two minors, and five others were wounded when a gunfight erupted between armed civilians at Sunday night's cockfight in Cuajinicuilapa, the state prosecutor's office

The prosecutor's office said in a statement that the cause of the gun battle was under investigation. A senior state police official told AFP that "some of the dead were taken away by their relatives minutes before security forces arrived" while the wounded were taken to a nearby hospital. Authorities had earlier reported that 10 people were killed and seven wounded. Cuajinicuilapa, which lies near the state of Oaxaca, is famous for its mixture of cultures derived from descendants of African slaves. The area is not known for the type of violence that has plaqued other parts of Guerrero, such as the Pacific resort of Acapulco or mountain regions of the interior beset by drug cartel turf wars.

Acapulco has become Mexico's murder capital, with the violence leaving four dead and three wounded after an amateur football game on the outskirts of the city on Sunday, municipal police said. The attack took place in broad daylight when gunmen burst onto the field and shot at the players as they were relaxing after the game. Relatives of the victims removed the bodies before the authorities arrived, police said. Authorities found bullet casings matching the caliber of AR-15 assault rifles as well as shotguns and handguns. There were no apparent links between Sunday's two shootings.

Remains found in pit

Guerrero is the state where 43 teacher college students disappeared after they were abducted by local police in the city of Iguala on September 26, 2014. Prosecutors say the officers handed the students over to the Guerreros Unidos drug cartel, which killed them, incinerated their bodies at a landfill in the town of Cocula and threw bags of remains in a nearby river. The case has renewed interest in the plight of the 25,000 people who remain missing across Mexico. It also led to the discovery of more bodies buried in clandestine graves around the

DEATH ROW - LAST STOP FOR MANY US VETERANS

WASHINGTON: Executed in 2015 in the US state of Georgia, Andrew Brannan is one of thousands of US soldiers who serve, come home from battle with mental scars, commit murder and are put to death. At least 10 percent of those executed in the United States are military veterans, according to a report out yesterday. Alarmingly, courts hardly take into account the psychiatric conditions of the military veterans, according to the Death Penalty Information Center (DPIC). A video of Brannan's behavior when he was stopped for speeding on January 12, 1998 gives some insight into his state of mind. In the video, taken by the dashboard camera of police officer Kyle Dinkheller, Brannan emerges from his pickup truck and starts dancing crazily, trying to provoke the officer and refusing to follow orders. Leaving a vehicle when stopped by a police officer is forbidden in most US jurisdictions. "Fuck you!", Brannan shouts, "I am a fucking Vietnam Veteran!"

Once back in his car, Brannan grabs a weapon. Gunfire breaks out. Dinkheller is hit nine times and dies on the spot. Brannan, with a wound in the abdomen, gets back in his pickup. The video is shown at police training academies. At the trial, Brannan's lawyers tried unsuccessfully to get lenient treatment based on extenuating circumstances. Decorated for his bravery, Brannan had been diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disor-

From glory straight to infamy

"Given that less than seven percent of the US population are veterans, very often judges, juries, prosecutors and even defense attorneys are essentially unfamiliar with the military experience," Art Cody, Legal Director Veterans Defense Program at the New York State Defenders Association said. "There may be a perfunctory acknowledgment of veteran status, but very often judicial decision makers lacks sufficient understanding of how the military background and experience has affected the veteran-defendant and the crime with which he or she is charged," he

Some 300 veterans are on death row across the United States, and any were decorated soldiers before their downward spiral. Such was the case of Robert Fisher, a Vietnam War veteran. President Lyndon Johnson awarded Fisher a Purple Heart for combat wounds he received in 1967. Thirteen years later, deeply affected by mental illness, Fisher killed his partner. — AFP

University of Missouri Chief RESIGNS AFTER RACE PROTEST

COLUMBIA: The University of Missouri's president stepped down on Monday after protests by the school's football team and other students over what they saw as his soft handling of reports of racial abuse on campus. Tim Wolfe's high-profile resignation was the latest shock to the state of Missouri, and the United States at large, which has been roiled for more than a year by racial tensions after police shot and killed an unarmed young black man in the state.

Unrest at the university, widely known as "Mizzou," started on Sept 12 when Payton Head, president of the Missouri Students Association, said on his Facebook page that he was repeatedly racially abused on campus by someone riding in a pickup truck. His post went viral, and the lack of any strong reaction by Wolfe led to demonstrapresident of the four-campus system. As a state school, it receives public funding. Up until Monday, Wolfe had shown no inclination to resign, although he had acknowledged change was needed and had planned a new "diversity and inclusion strat-

In a televised news conference on Monday held to announce his resignation, an emotional Wolfe said, "I take full responsibility for this frustration and I take full responsibility for the inaction that has occurred." "My decision to resign comes out of love, not hate," he added, quoting passages from the Bible. "Please, please use this resignation to heal, not to hate."

Wolfe, a former software executive who joined the university in 2012, is the 23rd versity would create the role of Chief Diversity, Inclusion and Equity Officer and start a full review of the school's policies on staff and student conduct within the next three months.

Tigers threatened strike

The football team, known as the Tigers, suspended practice on Saturday and Sunday, and more than 30 black players had vowed not to return until Wolfe resigned or was fired. That would have been a financial hit to the university, which, under its contract, would have had to pay \$1 million to next weekend's opponents, Brigham Young University, if the Tigers failed to play.

Missouri's athletics department said on Twitter that football activities would resume on Tuesday in preparation for Saturday's game. In addition to the team's action, student Jonathan Butler held a weeklong hunger strike, which he ended on Monday. "It should not have taken this much, and it is disgusting and vile that we find ourselves in the place that we do," Butler told reporters on campus after Wolfe announced his resignation. Protests on campus had been led by a group called ConcernedStudent1950, which says black students have endured racial slurs and believes white students benefit from favoritism in many aspects of cam-

The group, which takes its name from the year the university first admitted black students, on Monday demanded an immediate meeting with the university's faculty council, Board of Curators and the governor of Missouri to discuss shared governance of the school. "While today may seem bright to some, this is just a beginning in dismantling systems of oppression in higher education, specifically the UM system," Marshall Allen, a member of the group, told more than 500 people gathered on campus.

"This was the right decision to help the university turn the page, and for its leaders to recommit to ending racism on campus," US Senator Claire McCaskill of Missouri, a Democrat and a graduate of the school, said in an emailed statement. Missouri Governor Jay Nixon, also a Democrat, welcomed the move. "Tim Wolfe's resignation was a necessary step toward healing and reconciliation on the University of Missouri campus, and I appreciate his decision to do so," Nixon said in a statement. A majority of the approximately 35,000 students at the university in Columbia, about 125 miles west of St Louis, is white. Total enrollment at the university is 35,488, according to the school's website, including undergraduate, graduate and professional students. Last year, in the school's most recent figures available, about 7 percent of students were black. Racial tensions in Missouri flared last year when a white policeman in the St. Louis suburb of Ferguson killed an unarmed young black man and a grand jury brought no charges against the officer. The shooting kindled nationwide soul-searching and protests about the treatment of blacks by law enforcement.

Recent problems at the university started with the shooting in Ferguson, Justin Honore, a 20-year old sophomore from Dallas, told Reuters amid celebrations on campus. "There was a lot of racial tension around the Ferguson issue. A lot of the student body are from the St. Louis, Ferguson area," said Honore, who is black. "When a lot of that was going down, they felt very hurt and judged that people were jumping to conclusions about their community, about who they were." Racial tensions have dogged other American schools as well recently. Yale University saw small-scale protests last week after a fraternity turned away black guests at a Halloween party, saying, according to reports at the time, that only white women would be admitted. — Reuters

ITALY'S BID TO IDENTIFY SHIPWRECKED MIGRANTS

MELILLI, Italy: The shy children from a dogeared photograph found in the pocket of a migrant drowned off Italy may never know what happened to the man who might have been their father.

Putting names to those who die while crossing the Mediterranean to Europe is a huge challenge for forensic scientists, with clues sometimes limited to no more than a scar or a solitary tatoo.

Cristina Cattaneo and her team pull on sanitary gloves, robes and masks and transfer from refrigerated lorry to autopsy table the latest bodies to be recovered from an April shipwreck in which 800 people are believed to have died

"We have to do everything possible to give back names and surnames to these people," said Cattaneo, head of the Labanof Forensic Pathology Laboratory, which specializes in identifying decomposed, burned or mutilated remains.

Since the first large-scale migrant wrecks off Lampedusa in 2013, Italy has been looking at ways to establish the names of all those who perish while fleeing war, poverty or persecution in Africa, the Middle East or South Asia. It is a Herculean task: there are no passenger lists on crossings organised by traffickers, documents are quickly destroy in water and many people are not reported missing because relatives fear repercussions from oppressive governments.

Yet Italian pathologists examine one grey, bloated face after another in the hope of giving each of them a back story. And with at least 3,440 deaths already this year on sea crossings to Europe, other frontline countries like Greece, Spain and Malta are taking notes.

'Comparable to torture'

"This is one of the most complex mass disasters in the history of forensic science," said Cattaneo, as her team begins work in refrigerated tents in a hangar on the Melilli NATO base in Sicily, where they examine some 20 bodies a day. "It's a gesture of respect for human dignity," she said. "It has been shown that not knowing, leaving relatives of people probably dead in limbo, is comparable to torture."

Cattaneo was called in by Italy's missing person prefect Vittorio Piscitelli, whose ambition is to create a European database where DNA and other distinguishing features can be catalogued, allowing relatives in other EU countries or family members back home to find their dead.

A DNA test is only useful if close relatives can travel to Italy or send in their own samples for matching-not an option for many. So the Labanof team photographs features such as "the dental arch, forehead, earlobes, scars, any artificial limbs" tattoos or piercings, which are collected in an album to be shown to those looking for someone, Piscitelli said.

"We've already managed to identify 28 people this way, showing the album to people who travelled here from Germany, Switzerland, France," he said, adding that they hope to reach many others through the International Commission on Missing Persons (ICMP)

The ICMP made its name by identifying over two-thirds of some 40,000 missing people from the 1990s Balkan wars. It has since worked with victims of natural disasters such as Thailand's 2004 tsunami or Hurricane Katrina. It has offered to help Rome spread the word about the album, provide DNA swab kits which can be sent to Italy to be tested for a match, and repatriate bodies once they are identified.

'Disfigured by decay'

Piscitelli has also appealed to embassies, consulates and humanitarian agencies such as the International Committee for the Red

Cross for support. On the other side of Sicily, Palermo's anti-mafia squad has set up its own version of the album with photographs of objects recovered from corpses brought ashore here-many of them the victims of mass suffocations in the holds of crammed hoats.

The originals are kept in the vault: necklaces, passport photographs, pocket-sized Korans, mobile phones, 100 dollar and 50euro banknotes, stored forlornly in plastic pockets which give off the cloying odour of putrefaction. "Those poor victims after many days at sea arrived in absolutely indescribable conditions, they were unrecognisable, their faces disfigured by the advanced state of decay," said homicide department chief Carmine Mosca.

"Even those who had travelled with them, friends or family, could not recognise them," he said, adding that word of mouth helped draw relatives here. — AFP

MALDIVES ANNOUNCES END TO STATE OF EMERGENCY

MAL..., Maldives: The Maldives government announced yesterday an end to a state of emergency, which was imposed last week after an alleged attempt to assassinate President Abdulla Yameen.

"The Government of the Maldives today has lifted the state of emergency in the country with immediate effect," said a foreign ministry statement. "With the lifting of the state of emergency, all fundamental rights that were suspended, have been restored."

The government had reached its decision after the security forces advised Yameen that "the overall security situation in the country has improved", the statement added.

Yameen imposed the state of emergency last Wednesday in a move that gave wider powers to police and armed forces to arrest and suspending freedom of assembly and movement.

The Maldives, a popular destination for honeymooners, has been rocked by political unrest in recent months, which reached new heights last week when vice president Ahmed Adeeb was impeached.

Adeeb, whose predecessor was also

impeached in July, has been accused of high treason over an explosion on the presidential speedboat in September that left Yameen unhurt but injured his wife and one of his bodyguards. The state of emergency contains powers that had enabled Yameen's government to fast-track the impeachment process against Adeeb.

Yameen had insisted that it was necessary to use draconian powers to deal with a threat to his life and the stability of the nation of 340,000 Sunni Muslims living in a cluster of 1,192 tiny coral islands across the equator in the Indian Ocean.

However, his attorney-general Mohamed Anil while reading out a presidential decree removing the emergency said the tough laws were no longer required and there was no threat to the atoll nation, whose tourism industry took a nose dive after the state of emergency was imposed.

The former colonial power Britain as well as the United States, the European Union and neighboring Sri Lanka had called for an immediate end to the emergency which was seen as a tool to suppress dissent. — AFP

CAMERON LISTS DEMANDS FOR BRITAIN TO STAY IN EU

MERKEL 'REASONABLY CONFIDENT' OF AVERTING 'BREXIT'

LONDON: Prime Minister David Cameron warned yesterday that Britain could leave the EU if it does not get the reforms it wants before a "once-in-ageneration" referendum to settle its troubled relationship with Europe. In a major speech outlining Britain's demands for change following pressure from EU leaders, Cameron warned he was ready to "think again" about Britain's membership if he could not strike a deal with Brussels and the bloc's 27 other member states.

But in a sign of the British premier's looming tussle, the European Commission immediately responded, saying it deemed parts of Cameron's EU renegotiation objectives "highly problematic".

Cameron's comments came as he sends a longawaited letter to EU president Donald Tusk laying out Britain's shopping list for change to avert a "Brexit" in a vote due to be held by 2017 at the latest.

"The referendum... will be a once-in-a-generation choice," Cameron said. "This is a huge decision for our country-perhaps the biggest we'll make in our lifetime." He said he had "every confidence" of securing an agreement but added that he would not rule out campaigning for a "Brexit".

"If we can't reach an agreement and if Britain's concerns were to be met with a deaf ear, which I do not believe will happen, then we will have to think again about whether this European Union is right for us," he said. "I rule nothing out." The speech came nearly three years after Cameron first pledged a referendum on whether Britain should remain in the EU under pressure from eurosceptics in his Conservative Party and the anti-EU UK Independence Party.

Britain's turbulent ties with Brussels go back further than the Cameron era, though. The country joined what was then the European Economic Community in 1973 but has remained removed from the heart of Europe under successive prime ministers.

One of Cameron's Conservative predecessors, Margaret Thatcher, became an icon for eurosceptics in 1984 by securing an annual budget rebate for Britain, banging the table and demanding: "I want my money back". Britain also notably stayed out of the euro when it was launched in 2002.

'Final decision'

After Cameron won May's general election, his promise of a referendum became reality. Senior Conservatives and experts predict it will actually be held as early as next year.

Next month sees a crunch European summit in Brussels at which Britain's demands will be discussed but Cameron's Europe Minister David Lidington has played down the likelihood of getting a deal at that stage. Cameron has said he will campaign to stay in

the EU unless he cannot secure a deal which meets

his demands.

Ruling out a second referendum if Britain does vote to leave the EU, he said this would be the country's "final decision" on the issue.

While Cameron's speech did not contain substantial new details about Britain's demands, it is his clearest statement yet of what he is likely to push hardest on during the negotiations.

on during the negotiations.

He has long identified four broad areas where he wants to see reforms. These include improving competitiveness, greater "fairness" between euro-zone and non-euro-zone nations and sovereignty issues including an exemption from the aspiration of ever-closer union.

Most controversial is the demand to ban EU migrants to Britain from claiming some state benefits for four years after arriving.

Goodbye ever closer union?

In the speech, Cameron explicitly spoke against the central European tenet of ever-closer union, saying it was "not a commitment that should apply any longer to Britain". He stressed that he would not be pushing for individual national parliaments to be able to veto EU measures but wants groups of national parliaments to be able to club together to do so.

On his push to restrict benefits for EU migran

On his push to restrict benefits for EU migrants for the first four years of their time in Britain, he insisted he did not want to "destroy" the principle of freedom of movement which is at the heart of the European project. Downing Street has highlighted figures which show that 43 per cent of EU migrants rely on the support of Britain's benefits system during their first four years in the country.

Cameron's speech was greeted with scepticism by those who want Britain to leave the EU.

Merkel confident

Meanwhile, German Chancellor Angela Merkel said yesterday she was "reasonably confident" that a deal could be found with London to avert the possibility of Britain leaving the European Union. "What is on the table is no surprise, we want to work on the proposals with a solution-oriented attitude," she said after Prime Minister David Cameron laid out his demands for EU reforms. "There are some difficult (demands), others that are less difficult, but if we adopt the spirit that we can resolve this, then I am reasonably confident that we can succeed," she told journalists at a joint press conference with visiting South African President Jacob Zuma. — AFP

FRANCE MOURNS ANTI-COMMUNIST PHILOSOPHER GLUCKSMANN

PARIS: French philosopher Andre Glucksmann, a former Maoist who veered to the right after condemning the crimes of communism, has died at the age of 78, his son said vesterday.

The passionately political thinker rose to prominence in the 1970s alongside Bernard-Henri Levy as one of France's "New Philosophers", who broke with Marxism after street protests brought the country to the brink of revolution in 1968. "My first and best friend is no more," wrote Raphael Glucksmann on Facebook, describing his father as "a good and excellent man".

Strongly influenced by the Russian dissident Alexander Solzhenitsyn's account of his time as a political prisoner in "The Gulag Archipelago", Glucksmann railed against Soviet totalitarianism in his book "The Cook and the Cannibal" (1975), setting him on a collision course with left-wing existentialist intellectuals led by Jean-Paul Sartre.

But despite their differences, Glucksmann managed to persuade Sartre to join with France's then leading right-wing thinker Raymond Aron in campaigning for the Vietnamese "boat people" as they fled its communist regime in their thousands in 1979.

His friend, the writer and philosopher Pascal Bruckner, who has followed a similar path from left to right, told French radio that Glucksmann would be remembered for "delivering the staggering blow against communist thinking in France.

"At the time he had an enormous number of enemies, of people opposing him, but he held on," he said. "His ideas weren't just passing thoughts, they were real engagements which he physically stuck to every day." Levy, known in France as BHL, said he had been shaken by his death. "He was the only one of my contemporaries with whom I had the feeling of sharing the same fears about the world," he told AFP.

Survived Nazi occupation

Having survived as a Jewish child in Nazi-occupied France-a trauma which he recounted in his 2006 book "A Child's Rage"-Glucksmann became an advocate of international military intervention, accusing the West of often "deliberate blindness" to the evils around it. He later supported US-led invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan, and lobbied on behalf of Chechen Muslims during their war with the Russian government in the 1990s, later warning against European appeasement of

President Vladimir Putin.

"Recklessness and forgetfulness create the conditions for new catastrophes in both the economy and politics," he said. French President Francois Hollande paid tribute to Glucksmann, who died on Monday,

describing him as a man who "carried in him all the dramas of the 20th century... and spent all his life and intellectual training in the service of liberty."

With his pudding-bowl haircut, he was an instantly recognizable face on France's late-night television discussion programs, and one of the country's most prominent public intellectuals.

But ill with cancer, he appeared

But ill with cancer, he appeared less and less in public after the publication of "The Novel of the Universal Jew" in 2011. "He had several cancers, and he really battled," one of his publishers said yesterday. Despite still claiming to be "of the left", Glucksmann publicly sup-

ported Nicolas Sarkozy's successful bid for the French presidency in 2007. Sarkozy said yesterday that he had been "honored by his friendship" and said the philosopher had never allowed his "thinking to be prisoner to ideological

dictats".

Former socialist culture minister Jack Lang said that while he often disagreed with Glucksmann, as the son of Central European refugees who had fled to France, he was always a fearless defender of the weak. "The way a good part of Western society is now behaving towards the migrants is similar to what he attacked with regard to the boat people," he said. — AFP

POPE URGES FIGHT AGAINST EXPLOITATION IN ITALY'S 'CHINATOWN'

PRATO, Italy: Pope Francis yesterday urged Italy's textile city of Prato, home to a large Chinese community with widespread illegal sweatshops, to fight exploitation, illegality and corruption. Thousands of people lined the streets of the Tuscan city to hear the Argentine pontiff, who arrived by helicopter for a lightning visit, addressing the crowds from the cathedral's famous balcony, designed by Renaissance sculptor Donatello. Everyone, regardless of nationality, deserves "respect, inclusion and a decent job," Francis said, applauding the locals for their "constant efforts to integrate everyone" into their community.

However, "the life of every community requires we fight to the last the cancer of corruption... and poison of illegality".

The pontiff paid tribute to the victims of a fire which became a symbol of the city's dangerous sweatshops, describing it as "a tragedy born of exploitation and inhumane living conditions". The deadly blaze in a garment factory at the end of 2013 killed seven people who had been living and sleeping in close quarters inside the workshop and who were trapped inside by bars on the windows.

Francis urged locals not to "resign yourself in front of apparently difficult situations of coexistence" with Chinese garment workers in the city, where numerous Italian firms have been forced to close up shop, unable to compete. The 78-year-old pontiff, who was heading off to address Italian bishops in Florence, toured the cathedral square in his popemobile as pilgrims waving the Vatican's yellow and white flag cheered in the sunshine.

'A model city'Prato is officially home to over 16,000

Chinese nationals out of a total of 191,000 inhabitants. But local sources say the real figure could be as high as 50,000 — close to a quarter of the population.

In the suburb around Via Pistoiese, shop signs are written in both Mandarin and Italian. Some among even the third-generation residents, born and raised here, do not know the language of Dante. They have revitalised a flagging textile industry, though Italians quibble with their method: Chinese workers churn out clothes made of cheap imported cloth and the companies can legally sell them with the "Made in Italy" label.

"Each week we try and visit 20 Chinese businesses, we explain what the rules are in terms of security, environment and book-keeping... we help them to understand and abide by the law," Wang Li Ping, head of CNA World China, said. Luca Giusti, President of the Chamber of Commerce of Prato, said the Chinese workers represent "unfair competition because they don't respect the rules," and encourage a dangerous drop in standards in labour conditions.

He admits, however, that the community is worth "between 9.0 and 10 percent" of the city's Gross Domestic Product. Prato's young mayor Matteo Biffoni knows he has an unenviable task in trying to crack down on the illegal sweatshops, which more often than not spring up again elsewhere mere weeks after they are closed by police. But he insisted change is happening thanks to the efforts made by the younger generations and says his aim is for Prato to become "a model city on a national level" in terms of integration. —AFP

India's Modi Heads to Britain seeking investment

NEW DELHI: Narendra Modi will begin his first visit to Britain as Indian prime minister yesterday, seeking to boost investment in his booming country and win the backing of a large and influential diaspora community. Modi will have lunch with Queen Elizabethan honor usually only accorded to heads of state-and address parliament as Britain rolls out the red carpet for the leader of one of the world's fastest-growing major economies.

Around 60,000 British Indians are expected to attend a sell-out rally at Wembley Stadium billed as the biggest reception ever given to a foreign leader in Britain.

It is a remarkable turnaround for a politician who was effectively banned from visiting the former colonial power for nearly a decade over anti-Muslim violence in his home state of Gujarat in 2002. Britain was among the first Western countries to end its boycott of Modi, who has denied any wrongdoing over the violence that killed more than 1,000 people, mostly Muslims.

Prime Minister David Cameron will come under pressure to raise the subject of human rights in India after 40 lawmakers including opposition leader Jeremy Corbyn signed a motion for parliament to debate a host of issues. They range from alleged abuses by police in Indian-administered


Kashmir to an Indian government ban on a BBC documentary about a 2012 gang rape in New Delhi that shocked the world.

'Safe and stable bet'

But investment and trade will be the main focus of the visit. Cameron has visited India three times as prime minister, eager to boost trade with the rising Asian power, which reached \$14 billion in 2014-15 according to Indian government figures.

A Downing Street spokeswoman said "nothing is off the table". "Our focus is on how can we work together on challenges facing our countries from economic prosperity to security," she told AFP.Modi will meet chief executives for a roundtable discussion in London, seeking investment to maintain a pace of economic growth that has hit around seven percent. "My message to the business community

is clear-come, make use of the opportunities India is offering and invest in India," he said in a Facebook post. Analysts said the Indian premier, who swept to power last year on a promise to create jobs for a growing young population, would seek to sell India as a safe bet to investors in London-one of the world's main financial centres. "The main thrust will be on leveraging investors," said Sreeram Chaulia, Dean of the Jindal School

of International Affairs. "India stands out as a rare beacon and the prime minister will play that up, focus on that really, and say, 'look, India's a safe and stable bet".

Mitigating against that message is an

ongoing tax dispute between Indian authorities and Britain's Vodafone that has become a symbol of the problems foreign firms face in doing business in Asia's third-largest economy. That will likely feature on the

agenda, as will Indian plans to market rupee-denominated "masala bonds" in London. Defence deals are also on the cards as India undertakes a multi-billion-dollar upgrade of its ageing military hardware. Among the \$15 billion worth of deals reportedly expected to be signed during Modi's stay is an agreement for Britain's BAE Systems to sell 20 more Hawk trainer aircraft

India remains the world's largest importer of defence equipment, but Modi has made clear his determination to boost the domestic industry, lifting a cap on foreign investment in defense production.

"India is now looking at purchases that involve technology transfer and manufacturing in India," said Neelam Deo, a former Indian ambassador and now director of the Gateway House think-tank in Mumbai.

Protests planned

Modi will also inaugurate a London memorial to the low-caste leader of the struggle for Indian independence, Bhimrao Ambedkar, during his three-day visit.

It comes as the Hindu nationalist leader faces criticism at home over what critics see as rising intolerance after a spate of violent attacks on secular intellectuals and Muslims. — AFP

SUU KYI PARTY SET FOR MAJOR WIN IN MYANMAR ELECTION

SUU KYI SAYS SHE, NOT NEW PRESIDENT, WILL CALL THE SHOTS

YANGON/MANDALAY: Myanmar democracy champion Aung San Suu Kvi made it clear vesterday that she was ready to defy the powerful military's attempts to clip her wings, as fresh results from Sunday's historic election showed her party heading for a resounding

As vote tallies trickled in, Suu Kyi's long-oppressed National League for Democracy (NLD) looked set to take control of most regional assemblies as well as forming the central government, a triumph that will reshape the political landscape. Under the constitution drawn up by Myanmar's former junta, Suu Kyi is barred by the constitution from taking the presidency because her children are foreign nationals, a clause few doubt was inserted specifically to rule her out.

But in two interviews yesterday, the Nobel peace laureate said that, whoever was appointed president by the newly elected houses of parliament, she would call the shots. She told the BBC that she would be "making all the decisions as the leader of the winning party" and Channel News Asia that the next president would have "no authority". The ruling Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP), which was created by the junta and is led by retired soldiers, has conceded defeat in a poll that was a milestone on Myanmar's rocky path from dictatorship to democracy.

The NLD said its tally of results posted at polling stations showed it was on track to take more than twothirds of seats that were contested in parliament, enough to form Myanmar's first democratically elected government since the early 1960s.

The party would win more than 250 of the 330 seats not occupied by the military in the lower house of parliament, NLD spokesman Win Htein predicted yesterday. Under the junta-crafted constitution, a quarter of the seats are unelected and reserved for the armed forces.

Reuters was not able to independently verify the party's own estimates of its performance.

The election commission said the NLD had won 78 of the 88 seats declared so far for the 440-strong lower house. No seats have been declared in the upper house. Official results also showed that Sunday's election had handed the NLD a landslide win in the battle for regional assemblies, with Suu Kyi's party winning 143 of the 165 seats declared so far for local legislatures and the USDP just 12.

"The difference between the parties is huge. It's a clear win," said Sitida, a 37-year-old Buddhist monk in the central city of Mandalay who marched in the country's 2007 "Saffron Revolution" protests that were bloodily crushed by the junta. Sitida, who was sentenced to 70 years in prison for his role in the demonstrations but was given amnesty as part of political reforms in 2011, said the military would now have to accept the NLD's win and negotiate an orderly retreat from politics. "Daw Suu can make this happen. Daw Suu can convince them," he said, referring to Suu Kyi with an honorific.

However, while the USDP has been cut down and much of the establishment shaken by the extent of Suu Kyi's victory, the army remains a formidable power.

In addition to his bloc of parliament seats, the commander-in-chief nominates the heads of three powerful and big-budget ministries - interior, defense and border security - and the constitution gives him the right to take over the government under certain circumstances.

The military has said it will accept the outcome of the election, and Suu Kyi said times have changed since the 1990 election she won a landslide that the military ignored. She spent years under house arrest following that poll.

"I find that the people are far more politicized now than they were ... so it's much more difficult for those who wish to engage in irregularities to get away with it," she told the BBC. — Reuters

THOUSANDS PROTEST AFGHAN KILLINGS AS SECTARIAN FEARS RISE

GHAZNI, Afghanistan: Around 2,000 members of Afghanistan's Hazara ethnic minority held an angry protest yesterday after militants killed seven members of their community at the weekend and dumped their partially beheaded bodies. The killing of the seven Hazara, including three women and two children, during fighting between rival Taleban factions and Islamic State sympathisers, highlighted the risk that worsening sectarianism could add a lethal twist to daily violence sweeping Afghanistan.

The mainly Shia Hazaras have long suffered illtreatment and persecution in Afghanistan, with thousands massacred by al Qaeda and Taliban militias in the 1990s

This year, a series of kidnappings and murders of Hazara fuelled fears that the group was being deliberately targeted, and the latest killings in the southern province of Zabul triggered a furious wave of reaction on social media. In a sign of anger among the Hazara, the bodies of the dead were taken to Ghazni, a city in central Afghanistan with a large Hazara community, where crowds marched to the provincial governor's compound

Bearing the coffins of the dead aloft and chanting slogans against the Taliban, Islamic State and the government in Kabul, the crowd demanded punishment for the killers.

"We ask the government to find the reason behind this serial killing of Hazaras in Afghanistan and bring the perpetrators to justice," Ghulam Ali, a protester, said. Since the killings of the 1990s, the Taleban has largely avoided specifically targeting Hazaras or Shia Muslims, but the rise in the number of fighters claiming allegiance to the even more hardline Islamic State movement may change that. Afghanistan is divided among a patchwork of ethnic groups, including Tajiks, Hazaras, Uzbeks and Turkmen, mainly in the north and west, as well as Pashtun, the largest single group, located mainly in the south and east.

While sectarian violence has regularly broken out in the past, it has not been a major feature of the fighting in recent years and any resurgence would add a dangerous new complication for the government of President Ashraf Ghani.

The Taleban's success in seizing control of the northern city of Kunduz and holding it for three days a few weeks ago delivered a huge blow to public confidence in the government's ability to control security. But in recent days, the Taleban has been caught up in troubles of its own after a splinter faction defied Mullah Akhtar Mansour, who assumed the leadership in July following confirmation of the death of the movement's founder Mullah Omar.

Fierce fighting between the rival factions continued on Tuesday and spread beyond the southern province of Zabul into Herat and Farah in the west, according to Mullah Abdul Manan Niazi, a spokesman for the breakaway faction. — Reuters

CHINA NOT AWARE OF PLAN TO DISCUSS SOUTH CHINA SEA

BEIJING: China is not aware of any plan to discuss the disputed South China Sea at an Asia Pacific leaders' summit next week in Manila, a senior Chinese diplomat said yesterday, amid tensions between China and the Philippines over the waters. For its part, the Philippines said it had no plan to raise the issue at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit from Nov. 17 to

Chinese President Xi Jinping is to attend the meeting of APEC, which includes the United States, China, Japan, South Korea, Indonesia and Canada and together accounts for 57 percent of global production and 46.5 percent of world trade.

"Everyone knows that APEC is primarily about discussing trade and financial cooperation in the Asia Pacific," Chinese Vice Foreign Minister Li Baodong told reporters in answer to a question.

"As far as I know, at this year's summit, there are no plans to discuss the South China Sea."

China has overlapping claims with Vietnam, the Philippines, Malaysia, Taiwan and Brunei in the South China Sea, through which \$5 trillion in ship-borne trade

A summit of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations last week, attended by both the United States and China, failed to produce a final statement because the delegations could not agree on whether to men-

tion the South China Sea dispute. China has been particularly angered by a case lodged by the Philippines with an arbitration court in the Netherlands over the South China Sea. China says it will neither recognize nor participate in the case. Philippine Foreign Secretary Albert del Rosario met Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in Manila for the first high-level talks between the two neighbors since 2011. "They expressed hope the contentious issues will

our side not to raise contentious maritime issues," Charles Jose, Manila's foreign ministry spokesman, told a news conference. He said Manila would not raise the South China Sea issue because of the arbitration case in The Hague and because APEC was "not the proper forum". — Reuters

CHINA SOFTENS TACTICS IN GLOBAL **HUNT FOR CORRUPTION FUGITIVES**

LONDON: China has changed tactics in its global man-hunt for fugitives wanted at home for corruption, after complaints from countries that objected to Beijing's practice of sending investigators to track them down, a top Chinese anti-corruption official said.

Liu Jianchao, in charge of repatriating Chinese corruption suspects who flee abroad, said in an interview Beijing had deepened cooperation with foreign governments and no longer sent officials abroad without clearance from the host country to try to convince the suspects to return home.

China has brought home more than 600 officials this year in a campaign dubbed "Operation Fox Hunt", pursuing them abroad as part of a wider crackdown on deep-rooted graft which Liu called "an arduous task". Seventeen of the top 100 suspects on which China's Interpol office issued a red notice in April have been repatriated, he said.

'The Chinese authorities at different levels ... didn't really mean to make any harm to the country that they were visiting, but then we got these complaints, we realised there's room for improvement in doing this job," Liu told Reuters on Monday on a visit to Britain to seek better legal cooperation.

"So now we are talking to the authorities of the relevant countries to seek their assistance and their understanding and we tell them in explicit terms that China will ... comply with the legal procedures, with the rules of your country," he said, in an unusually frank admission of the challenges Beijing has faced in trying to repatriate economic fugitives.

"DAUNTING" TASK

Western diplomats in Beijing say their governments have been infuriated by China sending agents to their countries to try to convince suspects to return, and that if China wants their help it must use above-board, legal methods and local courts.

The United States in particular has warned China about Chinese agents it says were operating on US soil to pressure fugitives to return. Western nations have balked at signing extradition deals with China, partly out of concern about its judicial system. Rights groups say Chinese authorities use torture and that the death penalty is common in corruption cases.

President Xi Jinping has driven the corruption crackdown since taking over the leadership of the Communist Party in late 2012. Since then dozens of senior officials have been investigated or jailed.

The Chinese government has given periodic updates of its progress in bringing graft suspects back to China, in some cases announcing batches of several dozen officials being returned.

However, the fight has been hampered by China's difficulty in getting suspected corrupt officials and assets from overseas. "The task remains daunting," said Liu, who is Vice Minister for the National Bureau of Corruption Prevention. He also heads the Department of International Cooperation within the party's Central Commission for Discipline Inspection.

Among those still overseas is Yang Xiuzhu, a former senior construction official in eastern Zhejiang province charged with corruption, who has been taken into custody by immigration authorities in the United States but has applied for asylum.

Her brother, regional official Yang Jinjun, was repatriated to China in September, the first time Beijing succeeded in bringing back a suspect from the United States. — Reuters

LATIN, ARAB LEADERS HOLD SUMMIT TO STRENGTHEN TIES

RIYADH: Arab and South American leaders converged on Saudi Arabia yesterday for a summit aiming to strengthen ties between the geographically distant but economically powerful regions. United Nations chief Ban Ki-moon is expected to attend the opening in Riyadh of the Fourth Summit of South American-Arab Countries, set to begin at 1600 GMT. State television showed the arrival of President Nicolas Maduro of Venezuela, whose country belongs to the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries along with Saudi Arabia, the world's biggest oil exporter.

President Rafael Correa of Ecuador, OPEC's smallest member, also arrived. It was not immediately clear whether other Latin American heads of state would be present. Arab presidents who arrived included Omar al-Bashir of Sudan, Abdel Fattah El-Sisi of Egypt and Fuad Masum of Iraq, as well as Palestinian leader Mahmud Abbas, state media said.

Other leaders include Gulf rulers and King Abdullah II of Jordan. Ahead of the two-day meeting, Sudanese Foreign Minister Ibrahim Ghandour said windows of cooperation have long existed "but haven't been open

enough to take advantage of the capabilities" of both regions. For example, Sudan has land and water "that could enable it to become the Arab and South American food basket". The summit between the 22 Arab League members and 12 nations from South America was first held in 2005. The gatherings were an initiative of then Brazilian president Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, whose country hosted the first summit.

'Moving forward'

Ahead of the summit, Arab League Secretary General Nabil al-Arabi told Kuwait's KUNA news agency that "trade between both regions has amounted to \$30 billion after it was no more than \$6 billion in 2005." Peru, which hosted the third meeting in 2012, last month became one of 12 Pacific rim countries to seal the world's largest free trade area, known as the Trans-Pacific Partnership. Chile is the only other South American nation included in that deal. Saudi columnist Abdulateef Al-Mulhim, writing in Monday's Arab News, said that together, the Arab and South American regions can help bring prosperity and stability to the

world. "The whole of the continent is moving forward with many visible and modern reforms to their political, economic, social and educational systems," he wrote of South America.

Saudi Foreign Minister Adel Al-Jubeir spoke of a "convergence of positions" between countries of the two regions on many issues and commended the Latin American nations' "positive stance" towards the Palestinian question. Jubeir told a pre-summit meeting that the previous three summits tried to develop trade, investment and transport links. There remain "promising opportunities for collaboration", he said, according to a written text of his Monday speech. Two South American nations, Argentina and Brazil, belong to the Group of 20 world's largest economies, as does Saudi Arabia. The

kingdom and its Gulf neighbors pump much of the world's oil, but Brazil and Venezuela are also major producers.

There are also cultural ties, as Chile hosts about 350,000 Palestinian immigrants and their descendants who have settled there over the past century. Recent immigration has taken more than 2,000 Syrian refugees fleeing the war in their homeland to Brazil since 2011. The figure is far more than for any other Latin American state, although some pledged open doors and Venezuela's President Maduro said 20,000 were welcome in his country. However, Maduro is a staunch ally of Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad, who is facing rebel forces supported by Saudi Arabia and other Arab states. — AFP

Barghash and his family members still have a last chance to go the Supreme Court whose rulings are final. Barghash was in the Palace of Justice waiting for the ruling and said he accepts the verdicts of the judiciary but hinted at a challenge. In its ruling, the Appeals Court said that the only aspect in the nationality law that Kuwaiti courts can handle is when authorities refuse to grant children of Kuwaiti fathers their citizenships and not other aspects. It said that Barghash and his brothers and sister obtained their nationality in the early 1960s in a different way.

It said that their father had lived in the country since before 1920 but at the time of implementing the nationality law in 1959, he was very ill and died before registering himself and his children. Later, his children obtained the citizenship after witnesses testified to authorities that they were living in the country before the Nationality Law and their father died before registering, the court said. Accordingly, their father was not Kuwaiti and the court cannot handle their case, it said. The court had revoked the citizenship of several opposi-

tion members and even deported Saad Al-Ajmi, an activist with the opposition Popular Action Movement, after withdrawing his nationality.

In another development, Oil Minister Ali Al-Omair appears to be headed out of the ministry after two years in the post following non-stop controversies with top oil executives. The most likely scenario, expected to be announced today or early next week, is to move Omair to the Ministry of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs while the State Ministry for National Assembly Affairs will remain with him. The solution involves dissolving the board of directors of Kuwait Petroleum Corp (KPC) and appointing new executives. The next oil minister is likely to be State Minister for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammad Al-Abdullah Al-Sabah or Anas Al-Saleh.

MP Ahmad Al-Qhudhaibi, who was at loggerheads with Omair and was preparing to grill him, welcomed the news about the minister's planned exit and said this proves that his decisions in the oil sector were not correct. The lawmaker said that the plan proves that oil ministers have no powers to move top oil executives out of their positions. He said the plan shows that the supremacy of law in Kuwait has emerged the winner.

Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Russian Minister of Culture Vladimir Medinsky for cultural and artistic cooperation between Kuwait's National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters (NCCAL) and the Russian Ministry of Culture. A cooperation MoU between the Kuwaiti Ministry of Communications and the Russian Ministry of Transportation was also signed. Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Anas Khaled Al-Saleh signed it with Russia's Minister of Transportation Maksim Sokolov. A statement of intent was signed between the Kuwaiti Ministry of Defense and the Russian firm Rosoboronexport for military equipment.

Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Sheikh

Khaled Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah signed the statement with Rosoboronexport's Director General Anatoly Isaikin. Finally, CEO of the Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) Nizar Al-Adsani signed a MoU with Chairman of Russia's Gazprom Board of Directors Alexey Miller for cooperation between both firms. A joint investment MoU was signed between the Kuwait Investment Authority (KIA) and the Russian Direct Investment Fund. It was inked by KIA Managing Director Bader Al-Saad and Director of the Russian fund Kirill Dmitriev.

In another development, Russian President presented yesterday His Highness the Amir with an old copy of the Russian Pravada newspaper dated on March 13, 1962, which handled the forging of diplomatic relations between the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the State of Kuwait. — Agencies

THE MYANMAR ELECTION: WHAT WE KNOW SO FAR

yanmar's opposition looked poised yesterday for a landslide poll win, but even if Aung San Suu Kyi's party does form a majority, governing a impoverished nation where the military retains huge influence will be no mean feat. Here's what we know so far about the election and what it means for the nascent democracy.

Who won?

Right now it's hard to say unequivocally, as full results aren't in. But from the few seats declared, Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) party is sweeping the board. Her party has won 78 of the 88 seats announced so far in the lower house, which has a total of 323 seats up for grabs. They have done particularly well in their Yangon stronghold, taking all the city's declared seats, as well as making strong gains in the important Mandalay region. And they've even taken a few seats in Myanmar's ethnic minority regions. That suggests the NLD may mop up in regions where many thought the vote was more likely to go to smaller ethnic parties. The NLD is also dominating many regional parliamentary seats — 142 out of 162 declared so far-which could give them significant influence over important local authorities. There are a total of 652 regional parliamentary seats to fill. No upper house results have been released yet, nor do we know yet whether Suu Kyi has won in her own constituency of Kawhmu.

Will NLD form the next govt?

At the current rate of results, it certainly looks like it. Under Myanmar's complicated 2008 militarycrafted constitution, the NLD needs to take at least 67 percent of seats in both the lower and upper houses to form a government. Its rivals, the armybacked Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP), only needs to win a third. That's because a quarter of seats in the legislature are reserved for military appointees. In a BBC interview yesterday, Suu Kyi said she believed the NLD were on track to take 75 percent of seats, which would push her party well over the 67 percent threshold. Challenges ahead? Firstly, Suu Kyi can't be president-she is currently forbidden from taking the top spot under the constitution, which bans those with foreign children. Her two sons are British.

Secondly, even if she forms a majority, any major constitutional reform is going to be very difficult. The army bloc within the legislature can effectively veto any changes to the charter. That means a Suu Kyi presidency remains a distant prospect-an obstruction the powerhouse politician cryptically vowed to circumnavigate by being "above the president". A third issue is that the military still holds other constitutional cards, including the top security posts at the home, defense and border affairs ministries. "There are lots of levers of power and they control the ones they need to," said Richard Horsey, an independent Myanmar analyst.

How will the president be chosen?

Myanmar's president is directly elected by the legislature. With the existing parliament sitting for a final session from Monday, new MPs won't take up their seats until the end of January. Once the new parliament is up and running, electing the new president can begin, some time around February or March 2016. The lower and upper houses will each put forward a candidate, as will the military bloc. The whole parliament then votes on the three-the winner becomes president and the losers vice presidents. Even if the NLD's chosen candidate wins, he or she will likely have at least one military-backed vice president. Nicholas Farrelly, director of the Myanmar Research Centre at the Australian National University, said the NLD is well aware of the uphill struggle they face. The NLD "has thought about governing for more than a quarter of a century. That's a long time to wait", he said.— AFP

PUTIN'S DAUGHTERS AND RUSSIAN 2ND-GENERATION ELITE

ince Vladimir Putin began cementing his grip on Russia in the 1990s, many of his friends have grown famously rich. Not so the president himself, say his supporters, who insist Putin is above the money grab that has marked his reign. His public financial disclosures depict a man of modest means. In April, Putin declared an income for 2014 of 7.65 million roubles (\$119,000). He listed the ownership of two modest apartments and a share in a car parking garage.

His daughter Katerina is doing considerably better, supported by some of the Russian president's wealthy friends, a Reuters examination shows. After unconfirmed media speculation about Katerina's identity, a senior Russian figure told Reuters that she uses the surname Tikhonova. Andrey Akimov, deputy chairman of Russian lender Gazprombank, said he had met Katerina when she was little and more recently, and that Tikhonova was Putin's daughter.

Reuters has also learned that earlier this year Katerina, 29, described herself as the "spouse" of Kirill Shamalov, son of Nikolai Shamalov, a long-time friend of the president. Shamalov senior is a shareholder in Bank Rossiya, which US officials have described as the personal bank of the Russian elite. As husband and wife, Kirill and Katerina would have corporate holdings worth about \$2 billion, according to estimates provided to Reuters by financial analysts. That wealth stems mainly from a large publicly disclosed stake in a major gas and petrochemical company that Kirill acquired from Gennady Timchenko, another longtime friend of Putin.

Also among the young couple's holdings is a seaside villa in Biarritz, France, estimated to be worth about \$3.7 million. That asset, too, was acquired by Kirill from Timchenko, a commodities trader who has known the president since at least the 1990s. Katerina is also thriving in academia and running publicly funded projects at Moscow State University. A Reuters examination of public documents shows that the president's younger daughter has signed contracts worth several million dollars from state-owned organizations for work at the university to be carried out by organisations she directs. There is no indication she has made any personal finan-

cial gain from this work.

She holds a senior position at the university, and helps direct a \$1.7 billion plan to expand its campus. Katerina's official advisers at Moscow State University include five members of Putin's inner circle - including two former KGB officers who knew her when she was a toddler. They served with her father in the 1980s when he was deployed to Dresden, East Germany. Putin's elder daughter, Maria, is linked to Moscow State University as well. She is a graduate of the school's Fundamental Medicine Department and is forging a career in endocrinology, according to the subtlish capitals and a suppose the school of the supplies of the supplie

ing to publicly available documents.

Katerina, Maria and Kirill Shamalov all declined to comment for this article. Asked about the Biarritz home, a spokesman for Timchenko said he would not comment on personal matters. The stock acquisitions, state business deals, French property and oligarch connections offer a rare glimpse into the lives of Putin's children. The president has been very protective of his private life and his daughters, who seldom appear in the media. The transactions also provide insight into the family finances of Russia's most powerful man and the elite that has formed around him.

Katerina and Kirill, 33, are among a new generation of Russians enjoying a rapid rise in the wake of their well-connected parents. The phenomenon bears similarities to the "princelings" of China - the children and grandchildren of Communist Party leaders who have gone on to gain positions of power and amass great wealth. Olga Kryshtanovskaya, a sociologist and former member of Putin's United Russia political party, told Reuters that a "new aristocracy" was emerging in politics and state companies, with

a second generation inheriting the status of the current circle around Putin. "Many in society think they haven't worked for it, and they question who these people really are," she said.

Among other children of the Putin circle with growing influence are: Boris Kovalchuk, son of Yuri Kovalchuk, the largest shareholder of Bank Rossiya and a close Putin associate; Gleb Frank, son of former transport minister Sergei Frank and son-in-law of commodity billionaire Timchenko; Igor Rotenberg, son of the billionaire Arkady Rotenberg, Putin's former judo partner; Sergei S Ivanov, son of Kremlin Chief of Staff Sergei B Ivanov.

In an interview with Reuters, Alexei Navalny, a Russian opposition leader, described what he called a "neo-feudal system" that threatens to dominate state offices and big business. "Today in Russia, it is absolutely normal that the boards of directors at state banks are headed by children of security service officials, who aren't even 30 years old when they are appointed," he said. "It is more than just a dynastic succession. Children don't just inherit their parents' posts, but also the right to choose any other post they fancy. The danger is that very soon all key resources will end up in the hands of five to seven families."

Reuters asked the Kremlin whether Katerina Tikhonova was the daughter of Putin and

rapid progress since her Oriental studies as an undergraduate.

According to the website of Moscow State University, she is attached to the Mechanics and Mathematics Faculty. Under the name Tikhonova, she is listed as an author, along with other academics, of a chapter in a maths text book and at least six scientific papers since 2011. The papers include studies on medicines and space travel; one is listed as a study of how the human body reacts to zero gravity. Most of the papers were co-authored with the university rector, Viktor Sadovnichy. He did not respond directly to requests for comment, but the university issued a statement.

It said Tikhonova had proved to be a "talented researcher" who had "reported results of her research at scientific seminars and conferences many times." The statement added: "We do not have information about the private life of employees." Tikhonova is also the director of two initiatives connected to the university, the National Intellectual Development Foundation (NIDF) and the National Intellectual Reserve Centre (NIRC). She became director of the nonprofit NIDF in May 2013 and later became director of the NIRC as well.

The NIRC and NIDF created and run a project at the university called Innopraktika, which is also headed by Tikhonova. It sponsors and sup-

The university's rector, Sadovnichy, said in a May 2014 presentation published on the university website that NIDF, along with other entities, would be tasked with conducting an expert review of the expansion of the university. Tikhonova's role is to confer with and represent the views of the wider business community, she told Interfax in an interview this month. The \$1.7 billion expansion plan involves both public and private funding, and aims to double the size of the university campus by 2018 with new laboratories, academic buildings, schools, student accommodation, and a museum.

The NIDF did not respond to a request for comment. In an email, Innopraktika referred questions about its activities to Moscow State University and said it could not comment on Tikhonova's private life. The university said in a statement that many people were involved in its expansion plan, including university employees and outside experts. According to Russian state public records, since 2013 the NIDF has won contracts worth 182 million roubles (\$2.8 million) from Rosneft, Rosatom and Transneft, all state-owned companies. Of 10 contracts reviewed by Reuters, eight were awarded without competitive tender. The contracts were mostly to carry out research at the university.

Transneft declined to comment. A spokesman for Rosatom said: "Rosatom cooperates with Innopraktika as well as other institutions ... As part of its strategy Rosatom aims at developing new projects." He said contracts were awarded openly and transparently. A spokesman for the oil company Rosneft said it was cooperating with Moscow State University on 17 projects that were worth a total of 530 million roubles.

In March 2015, Tikhonova was appointed as a deputy vice-rector of the university. It is not known whether the post pays a salary. Tikhonova's role in the expansion project, though not her family tie to Putin, was laid out in a report in January by Russian business news channel RBC TV. Her title at the university was first reported by opposition leader Navalny. Her appointment is noted in an official order by Sadovnichy posted on the university website. She does not appear on the ordinary list of staff, but she is listed as a member of the university's scientific council.

Asked about Tikhonova's title, pay and role, the university said in statement: "The National Intellectual Reserve Centre supports specifically young people in innovative activity of MSU, and that is why its activity is coordinated by the Rector's office ... Consequently the Centre's director Katerina Tikhonova is the deputy vicerector within this department."

whether she is married to Kirill Shamalov, and other questions. Dmitry Peskov, press secretary of the Russian Federation, replied: "We have no information whatsoever about the personal life, family connection, marital status, academic activities, involvement in particular projects and family tree of Ms Tikhonova, or about other individuals mentioned in your letter. "In recent years there has been an enormous quantity of gossip on the subject of the family ties of V. Putin, and, in particular, his daughters. The proportion of accurate information in all these publications is laughably small."

'Talented researcher'

Katerina has largely escaped public attention since her father became president in 2000. In 2011, Putin told Russian television that Katerina had read Oriental studies, specializing in Japanese and history, at St Petersburg University. Little else was known about her adult life until a Russian blogger, Oleg Kashin, reported in January that the president's younger daughter was active at Moscow State University and had taken the surname Tikhonova, derived from the name of her grandmother, Yekaterina Tikhonovna Shkrebneva.

As well as Gazprombank's Akimov, two senior academic sources one at Moscow State University and one scientist with close contacts there - also confirmed to Reuters that Tikhonova is Putin's daughter. She has made

ports young scientists. Innopraktika has a raft of advisers and partners who are close to Putin, including Sergei Chemezov and Nikolai Tokarev. The two men were KGB associates of Putin during his days as a spy in Dresden, Germany, living in the same apartment block as the future

Russian leader and his young family.

Chemezov is now the head of state-owned technology giant Rostec, and Tokarev is head of state-owned Transneft, a gas pipeline company. Tokarev did not respond to a request for comment. Chemezov's company Rostec said in a statement that Rostec assists in the state's development of industry, and that Chemezov's involvement with Innopraktika was therefore "natural and logical." Also among the trustees of Innopraktika, according to its website, are Igor Sechin, head of the state oil company Rosneft, and Andrey Akimov, deputy chairman of Gazprombank. Rosneft and Sechin declined to

Asked about Tikhonova and Innopraktika, Akimov said: "I knew it was Putin's daughter. But of course we took the decision to support MSU's projects irrespective of any family connections." Innopraktika's program coincided with the bank's own priorities, he said, including Gazprombank's "global idea of supporting scientific development." He said he did not believe that Tikhonova had received any special treatment, and that he supported the expansion plan of Moscow State University, regardless of Tikhonova's involvement.

Ocean views

Tikhonova is active beyond the university. Under that name, she has competed for years as an acrobatic rock'n'roll dancer. In 2013, she and her dancing partner came fifth in a world championship event in Switzerland. Today, she is chairman of two organising committees of the All-Russian Acrobatic Rock'n'Roll Federation, according to its website. The Federation's sponsors include Sibur, Novatek and Gazprombank - companies that are coowned or co-controlled by friends and associates of the president. These people include Timchenko; Kirill Shamalov; and Kirill's elder brother, Yury Shamalov. The same companies are also mentioned on Innopraktika's website as among its corporate partners.

A spokesman for Sibur said: "As for sponsoring the (Acrobatic Rock'n'Roll) Federation the motives are the same as in partnerships with other types of sport. At different times Sibur has supported the Russian basketball federation, Formula One team, many Russian hockey and football teams and many others." The spokesman said Sibur provided advice but not money to Innopraktika, and had long collaborated with Moscow State University. Novatek did not respond to requests for comment. — Reuters

LIVERPOOL'S IBE HOPING TO FLOURISH UNDER KLOPP

LONDON: Liverpool's teenage winger Jordan Ibe believes he can flourish and become a world-class performer under the guidance of new manager Juergen Klopp. Ibe scored his first goal for the Premier League club in last week's 1-0 Europa League win over Rubin Kazan and is encouraged by Klopp's track record of nurturing young talent. Klopp, who twice led Borussia Dortmund to the Bundesliga title and also to the final of the Champions League, honed the talents of players such as Robert Lewandowski, Mario Goetze and Marco Reus. "He obviously did a great job at Borussia Dortmund. The fact that the young players he

brought in were a big part of the success is very encouraging for guys like me," Ibe told the club's website (www.liverpoolfc.com). "Of course, those youngsters at Dortmund didn't just become a little bit better either-some of them, like Robert Lewandowski, have become players who are operating at the highest level in the Champions League. "Hopefully he can help me and some of the lads here do the same. I'm hoping my attributes-pace and strength and being able to go past people-will suit the way he wants to play and I can get some opportunities," the 19ear-old added. — Reuters

BENZEMA FILES COMPLAINT OVER FRENCH SEX TAPE PROBE

PARIS: Real Madrid striker Karim Benzema will lodge a complaint for violation of judicial confidentiality after French radio Europe 1 published extracts of phone taps that could incriminate the France international, his lawyer said yesterday. Benzema was placed under formal judicial investigation last week in connection with an alleged attempt to blackmail fellow French soccer international Mathieu Valbuena using a sex video. "Which extracts were chosen? The worst," Sylvain Cormier told Europe 1. "We're done playing now and we are announcing that we will file a complaint for violation of judicial confidentiality." Cormier has previously said that Benzema was "totally innocent" and "played no part in any blackmail or attempted blackmail". Benzema has been ordered to not make contact with others linked to the affair. — Reuters

VIEIRA JOINS NEW YORK CITY AS HEAD COACH

NEW YORK: Former France international Patrick Vieira has joined New York City FC as head coach on a three-year deal from parent club Manchester City, it was announced Monday. Vieira, who had been head of Manchester City's Elite Development Squad and had been talked of as a possible candidate to take the top job at the Etihad, replaces sacked coach Jason Kreis. It follows a disappointing season in the MLS for New York City, who invested heavily in star names such as Frank Lampard and Andrea Pirlo yet failed to make the postseason playoffs. "Patrick's ability, vision and the respect in which he is held by everyone who works with him, speaks volumes for his character and capacity to succeed," New York City FC President Tom Glick said. "I am excited to work with him and I know the energy he will bring to the role will have a hugely positive impact across the Club." Former France and Arsenal captain Vieira, a member of Les Bleus victorious 1998 World Cup and Euro 2000-winning squads said he was looking forward to starting his new job. —AFP

ISRAEL LOOKS TO THE US FOR BASEBALL TUTORS

WASHINGTON: Baseball is known as the national pastime of the United States. The same cannot be said in Israel, but a new program enlisting American Jewish ballplayers is aimed at honing the skills of Israeli hopefuls and elevating the game in the Jewish state. The Israel Association of Baseball is hoping its "Israel Baseball Experience" program, importing the American players for five months starting in January to play in the top Israeli baseball league, will turn out to be a grand slam. "We want guys to come over just to raise the level of playing and coaching in the country," said Nate Fish, the association's head national team coach. "If you can take 10 or 20 Division I college baseball players and you put them in the Premier League it would drastically impact the level of play. I'm not really worried about having too many of these guys." Art Shamsky, an outfielder with the 1969 World Series champion New York Mets who in 2007 served as manager of a team in a now-defunct Israeli baseball league, said his Israeli players "didn't understand the nuances of the game." "Baseball is a very subtle game in a lot of ways," Shamsky said. "Sure, there's run, throw, hit, pitch and field. But there are parts of the game you learn playing Little League or in high school. They didn't have that." Shamsky, who is Jewish, said there are some Israeli players who have some ability. "I wouldn't rule out some player over there eventually playing minor league ball and then make it to the big leagues (in the United States). This program could help

make it happen." Shamsky, 74, said the program could help Israel qualify for the World Baseball Classic (WBC), an international tournament point they said that about Japan, about China and Australia. It can be done." The American players, ages 18 to 29, will be set to play in the Premier League and go into communities around Israel to help promote and develop the game, the program's organizers said. The Americans are due to work with Israeli coaches and children in five cities, including Tel Aviv and Jerusalem. The Israeli national team, ranked 22nd in the world in baseball and sixth in Europe, is preparing to try to qualify next year for the 2017 WBC.


Few of the Israeli national squad's players are on Israel's WBC team, which consists mainly of American Jews who qualify to play for Israel in the tournament. WBC rules allow players to represent a country if they are merely eligible for citizenship. Israel lost in the WBC qualifying round in 2012, losing to Spain in the finals.

Shawn Green, 42, a retired two-time Major League Baseball all-star outfielder who is Jewish, said baseball "has started to take off in Israel" and that "the key is to get American players there."

"Not only can they help instruct and show the Israeli players how to play the game, they can also go out there and demonstrate what it takes to perform as a professional baseball player and exemplify the right way to play the game," Green said.

Fish acknowledged that current Premier League attendance is little more than "a few parents and friends scattered around," with no stadium announcer or concessions. He also noted that Israel's current security problems can intrude on sports.

"Baseball is an escape," Fish said. "We've had a lot of problems over the last month. For the kids that play, it's essentially a time where they don't have to think about it."

ROSE EYES CHINA DOUBLE WITH Dubai Glory Beckoning

SHANGHAI: Three weeks ago Justin Rose declared last month's Hong Kong Open would be his last event on the European Tour in 2015. Then he won it, and everything changed.

The Englishman now finds himself looking for back-to-back wins on Chinese soil with one goal in mind, winning the Race to Dubai. "Sometimes you make decisions based on what you know at the time, right?" Rose told AFP yesterday at Lake Malaren, Shanghai, venue for the \$7 million BMW Masters which starts on Thursday. "Obviously things changed for me.

"Winning in Hong Kong got me closer up the board and made it a realistic prospect to win the Race to Dubai." There are two events remaining, this week's BMW Masters in Shanghai and next week's season-ending DP Tour Championship in Dubai. World number six Rose is fifth in the European Tour Race to Dubai standings on 2,528,224 points — 865,699 behind leader Rory

But with 1,333,330 points up for grabs for the

winner both this week and next, Rose knows the won it, you have to take it. I would love to win it Race to Dubai is still in his own hands.

"I'm going to have to win one of these last two tournaments, that's all I know," Rose said. "I think if I win one of them and play solid in the other then I'm hard to beat.

"If I go win-win then I'm unbeatable so it's in my hands, which is the good thing."

'Modern era'

Rose won the old European Tour Order of Merit and the Harry Vardon Trophy back in 2007, two years before it was reincarnated as the Race to Dubai.

It's clear that he has a burning desire to add the newer version to his bulging CV that includes the 2013 US Open and a combined 34under-par score in this year's majors, the lowest ever recorded by a player who didn't win.

"Any time you have an opportunity to achieve something like winning the Race to Dubai or the Order of Merit, as it was when I last

in the 'modern era' as I call it," said Rose.

But the 35-year-old will not have it all his own way against a high-class field containing the top five challengers to McIlroy, who is not playing

Englishman Danny Willett, in second place, needs a top-25 finish to overhaul McIlrov after closing the gap to just 74,213 points with third place across the city at the WGC-HSBC Champions last week.

Then come Ireland's Shane Lowry (727,579 points behind McIlroy), South Africa's Louis Oosthuizen (791,816 behind), Rose and another South African Branden Grace (926,625 behind).

All can hit the number one spot before the season's climax next week with a win on Sunday. "I need to play well enough this week that if I win next week I don't have to worry about who finishes second," Rose said. "That probably means finishing second at worst this week to control my own destiny." —AFP

MALNATI WINS PGA TOUR BY ONE STROKE OVER TOMS, MCGIRT

MISSISSIPPI: Peter Malnati churned through the Mississippi mud to clinch a one-stroke victory at the \$4.1 million Sanderson Farms Championship in Jackson on Monday. In his 22nd start on the PGA Tour, Malnati sank a three-foot par putt at the last to card 67 and finish at 18-under 270, edging fellow Americans David Toms (69) and William McGirt (68) at the soggy Country Club of Jackson.

The PGA Tour sophomore, 28, became the fifth winner in as many tournaments in the new 2015-16 PGA Tour season, joining Emiliano Grillo (Frys.com Open), Smylie Kaufman (Las Vegas), Justin Thomas (CIMB Classic) and Russell Knox (WGC-HSBC

Knox, at 30, is the oldest of the quintet. Malnati said he had not been mentally ready for his first season on tour in 2014-15, but returned this time better prepared.

"Two years ago when I was on this tour, it was so hard for me to be in the moment," he told Golf Channel. "I knew the work I've put in would prepare me for this moment when it came. This is pretty cool right now." Torrential rain earlier in the week sent the event to a Monday finish on the saturated course, where preferred lies were allowed.

A dozen or so players looked capable of winning at one stage or another during the final round, but none rued what might have been more than joint runner-up McGirt, who agonisingly missed a 30-foot birdie putt at the last that would have forced a playoff.

NEPAL PLAYERS BAILED IN WORLD CUP FIXING CASE

KATHMANDU: A court granted bail yesterday to Nepal's national football captain and four other players charged with treason over alleged match-fixing in World Cup qualifiers, a lawyer for one of the defendants said.

"The Special Court has ordered the players to be released on bail," said Nani Babu Budhathoki, representing former national footballer Bikash Singh Chhetri.

All five players, including skipper Sagar Thapa and national goalkeeper Ritesh Thapa, have denied any involvement in match-fixing following their arrests last month in the capital.

Prosecutors have sought life sentences for the five, including defender Sandip Rai and coach Anjan KC, after they were charged on Sunday under a 1989 act against unlawfully jeopardising Nepal's sovereignty,

integrity or national unity.

"The court has declared bail in the amount of 500,000 rupees (\$5,000) for Anjan KC and Ritesh Thapa, 100,000 rupees for Sagar Thapa and 50,000 each for Sandip Rai and Bikash Singh Chhetri," Budhathoki told AFP. A physiotherapist, Dejiv Thapa, has also been charged with treason in absentia.

Detectives said the arrests came after significant sums of money were found deposited in the six suspects' bank accounts from suspected match-fixers based in Southeast

The six men are suspected of involvement in match-fixing over a period of eight years, including several games played in 2011 as part of Nepal's unsuccessful bid to qualify for the 2014 World Cup in Brazil.—AFP

'LEGENDARY' CHAMPION EDDERY DEAD AT 63

LONDON: Pat Eddery, the legendary 11-time British flat champion jockey, has died at the age of 63, the racing manager for owner Prince Khalid Abdullah announced yesterday.

The Irish-born horseman won over 4,600 races before retiring in 2003. Among his haul of big race wins were four Prix de l'Arc de Triomphes and three Derbys, making him one of the greatest jockeys of all time.

"It is extremely sad news," said Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager to Juddmonte owner Prince Abdullah of Saudi Arabia. "Everyone at Juddmonte is very shocked and saddened by it.

"He spanned the greatest era for jockeys ever. Lester Piggott, Steve Cauthen, Willie Carson, all were exceptional, yet Pat's ability was unquestioned."

In total Eddery triumphed in 14 British Classics, including three Derbys aboard Grundy (1975), Golden Fleece (1982) and Quest For Fame (1990). Perhaps his finest hour came aboard Dancing Brave in the 1986 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, when he made a late charge down the centre of the track to snatch a sensational victory against a glittering field.

His other Arc winners came aboard Detroit in 1980, Rainbow Quest (1985) and Trempolino (1987). He achieved other memorable successes with Pebbles at the Breeders' Cup and Silver Patriarch in the St Leger, which gave him his 4,000th win, in 1997.

Silver Patriarch was trained by John Dunlop who said: "Pat rode his first winner for me in 1973 at Bath and in all had nearly 400 winners for me. "I was lucky to be training in a vintage era of jockeys and the fact Pat rode for me on and off for 30 years tells you everything." Dunlop added: "He was a delightful man to spend time with, he had huge success but was great company at the same time. Above all, he just worked harder than the others I think. "Silver Patriarch was special. To come back from being beaten a nose in the Derby and win the St Leger, and for it to be his 4,000th winner made it a very memorable day." Carson, the five-time champion and a close friend and rival of Eddery, said: "Part of my life has gone because I knew Pat for a very long time. He was an absolute gentleman and one of the greatest jockeys to ever put a leg over a horse. "He was a born rider and always did the right thing and got horses running for him." Pebbles' trainer Clive Brittain recalled: "He was ice cool in any situation and nothing bugged him. There was nobody stronger and as a tactician he was out on his own.

"You didn't instruct Pat-he was natural. Whatever happened in the race Pat would adjust to and I'll miss him greatly." Tony McCoy, the 20-time champion jump jockey, tweeted: "Very sad news to hear of the passing of Pat Eddery, true genius in the saddle

Another multiple flat champion, Johnny Murtagh, wrote: "Sad to hear the passing of legendary jockey Pat Eddery. Everybody looked up to him in the weigh room, real pro

AUSTRALIA PROMISE NO LET UP FOR N ZEALAND

SYDNEY: Coach Darren Lehmann has promised no complacency after Australia's solid victory over New Zealand in the first Test, saying yesterday that his young team needed to do it all again in Perth. Australia crushed New Zealand by 208 runs in the first Test at the Gabba on Monday and now head to the WACA ground one up in the three-match series as the Kiwis manage several injuries.

Lehmann said the new-look Australian team, missing veterans such as Michael Clarke, Brad Haddin and Shane Watson, played well in Brisbane but there was room for improvement.

"For us now it's about getting back to Perth... making sure we are backing that performance up," he told reporters in Brisbane. "We've started well but we've got to back that up-that's the challenge for a young group, to back that up day in, day out." Lehmann said the Australians needed to improve their fielding which he said was "a little bit sloppy" as well as put more pressure on the New Zealand openers with the new ball.

He said he was impressed with new skipper Steve Smith and how he dealt with paceman Mitchell Starc, who was fined half his match fee by the International Cricket Council for throwing a ball dangerously at New Zealand batsman

Unlucky to miss out

"I was very happy with the captain and the way he handled that," Lehmann said. "He's had a chat to him and that's done and dusted from where I sit." Australia had the match well in hand with the New Zealanders one wicket away from defeat when Starc impetuously hurled the ball in Craig's direction after the Kiwi had smacked him for two successive fours. Lehmann said Starc, 25, had to find his "happy medium" on the field. "They're all great kids, they are all learning their way in international cricket," he said. "You love to see the aggression, it's just making sure it's at the right time."

Lehmann said a decision on the final team for the second Test would be made after an inspection of the pitch later yesterday.

"If it (the line-up) changes, it changes, but obviously someone is going to be unlucky to

miss out again," he said. New Zealand, who suffered the dubious dismissal of Brendon McCullum in the second innings at the Gabba, head to Perth with a question mark over pace spearhead Tim Southee, who has a back injury. His fitness will be assessed Wednesday.

All-rounder James Neesham has already been ruled out of the series with back trouble.

"We know that they are a good side and we've got to play well again in Perth and certainly start the Test match well," Lehmann said. For his part, New Zealand coach Mike Hesson said his team needed to be more aggressive in Perth, after coming to Brisbane "a bit underdone from a skill perspective".

"We need more aggressive intent with the ball," the Australian Associated Press reported him as saying. Hesson said Southee was progressing well but they would not risk him if he was not ready to play. "He is a huge part of our side and leads our attack but we are not going to take someone in unless he is confident he can play for us," Hesson said. The second Test at the WACA begins Friday.— AFP

MORGAN CONFIDENT WITH NEW SAFTEY GEAR

ABU DHABI: England captain Eoin Morgan said yesterday he believed that new gear and renewed confidence will help him negotiate shortpitched bowling after being hit by Australian paceman Mitchell Starc two months ago.

Morgan, 29, suffered concussion after the blow during the fifth and final one-day match at Manchester which also cut short his county season. But a refreshed Morgan said he will wear a protective helmet with a neck guard in the four-match series which starts in Abu Dhabi today-his first match since the incident.

Morgan said the blow was a hard one. "At the time, it was quite concerning," said Morgan of the incident. "The ball hit me quite hard. It was quite a good delivery. I've watched it back a number of times. "But I still look back at it now - and hats off, it was a pretty good delivery."

The cricket world was rocked by the death of Australian batsman Philip Hughes after being hit on the head by a bouncer in a first-class match in Sydney in November last

The sad incident increased safety demands for batsmen with the introduction of new helmets which also protect the back of the neck. Morgan said he will be using one of the redesigned helmets. "I did change it (helmet) during the series (against Australia). I got hit on the neck at Lord's and wasn't wearing a neck guard, I changed to a new helmet.

"It's a personal opinion, I feel more protected with the neck guard that they have, so I went for the full helmet. I've had scans on my head to have a mould for my own helmet, which I'm wearing now, so I've come with that." Morgan said he has practiced to counter short-pitched balls. "I've done a lot of short-ball practice since then. I'm quite confident going into this series that I've progressed.

"It's worrying, to be honest, because the feeling of concussion is something I've never had before."

Morgan said England, the only top team which failed to qualify for the quarter-finals in the 2015 World Cup, has progressed well since then, beating New Zealand 3-2 and losing to Australia by the same margin. "That's one thing we've gained over the last six months. We've created an atmosphere in which learning becomes very easy for our young guys coming in. "Probably, no one would have given us a hope in hell against Australia and New Zealand. But they were two very competitive series, and we managed to turn over New Zealand.

The remaining matches will be played in Abu Dhabi (November 13), Sharjah (Nov 17) and Dubai (Nov 20). The two teams will also play three Twenty20 internationals. —AFP

"My candidacy is not in opposition to Michel. If he is able to stand, I will withdraw. It's a simple principle of loyalty. But right now I am a candidate 100 per cent and I'm moving forward, not

Speaking of his plans to run for world football's lead role, Infantino acknowledged he shared "lots of points in common" with Platini in relation to "development and reforms" but that he also had his own ideas. "I am Infantino and Platini is Platini. It's my programme. The priorities are the same but there will be some differences."

Forward Kevin Garnett, in his 21st season, played in that game, but more than a few of his present Minnesota team mates were in elementary school at the time. It looked as if the Timberwolves' inexperience might prove costly. Minnesota led 81-47 before the Hawks closed the third quarter on a 37-12 run behind 14 points by guard Jeff Teague to pull within 93-84 going into the fourth. Atlanta then kept up the comeback.

"We got frazzled," Mitchell said. Wiggins, though, pulled the Timberwolves through as they improved to 4-0 on the road. The reigning NBA Rookie of the Year sank 15 of 22 shots and got support from rookie center Karl-Anthony Towns, who finished with 17 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots. "We stayed confident," Towns said. "We just had to weather the storm." Wiggins scored 31 points in an overtime victory at Chicago on Saturday, and he wouldn't be denied with the game on

when asked about Wiggins. "That's what I saw." "He made plays after we were able to get up a point," Hawks coach Mike Budenholzer said. "He did a little bit of everything."

The Hawks, who scored 19 points off 10 Minnesota turnovers in the third-quarter rally, shot 72 percent in the third, with Teague going 6-for-8 and Millsap making all four of his shots. "They were shooting the ball so well that I knew it was going to be tough to come all the way back," Teague said. "But we made it a dogfight." Teague finished with 24 points and a game-high nine assists. Millsap added 22 points.

For the game, Minnesota shot 57.5 percent and Atlanta hit 51.2 percent from the floor. The Wolves compiled a 40-27 rebounding advantage. The Timberwolves shot 63.8 percent and beat the Hawks 22-11 on the boards while building a 72-42 halftime lead. "They came out playing very aggressively, and we came out without a lot of energy," said Hawks guard Kyle Korver, who was held to five points. "We're a team that has to play with a lot of energy, and we finally responded in the second half."

Asked what the difference was, Korver had a simple answer. "You just get mad once you're embarrassed," he said.

NO TAKERS FOR SERIE A SCUDETTO AMID JUVE WOES

MILAN: The battle for Serie A supremacy is the closest in years but Juventus sitting nine points off the pace is not enough for the Turin giants' potential

After 12 games, only five point separate the top five teams, four of whom can harbour serious scudetto ambitions following Juve's disastrous start to their title defence. But like poker players knowing they could be on a winning hand, none are giving much away.

Roberto Mancini, who won seven trophies including three consecutive league titles in his previous spell with Inter Milan, was dismissive after seeing his side pull level with leaders Fiorentina after a 1-0 win at Torino on Sunday. Fiorentina are playing some great football but Portuguese coach Paulo Sousa claims he just wants other teams to recognise the team's "quality". Roma now have no excuses as they go in search of a first league trophy since 2001, but two years of being humbled by Juventus has seen coach Rudi Garcia swap a tone of defiance for one of cautious optimism. As for Napoli? Try mentioning the word 'scudetto' around Maurizio Sarri and you'll be reminded they haven't won the title since Diego Maradona led them to the second of their two titles in 1990.

Treble winners in 2010, when Jose Mourinho led them to the league, Cup and Champions League titles, Inter are finally back in the hunt after years in the domestic wilderness.

Quality

Inter are the only team in the top five not involved in Europe this season, but that added bonus means little for Mancini. "I would say the others (title challengers) have a slight advantage because they've been playing together for longer," said Mancini. "This squad has only really been together since August. We're trying to create a quality squad that includes younger players that can

develop down the line." Although Italian football's 1990 heydays are long gone, this season could help rekindle a forgotten love for watchers of 'calcio'. Fiorentina haven't been champions since winning a second league crown in 1969, when they finished ahead of a Cagliari side steered by Italy legend Luigi 'Gigi' Riva.

But under Sousa, Fiorentina are flying, with Nikola Kalinic (7) and Josip Ilicic (4) hitting 11 of the team's 24 league goals so far. Sousa is among a select few players to have won back-toback Champions League titles, triumphing in 1996 with Juventus then a year later with Borussia Dortmund.

But when it comes to Fiorentina's title chances, he is modest: "We want to challenge every side in the league, but the best prize we can have at the end of the season is for our rivals to recognise our quality." Roma, who have hit a leagueleading 27 goals in 12 games, sit one point behind Fiorentina and Inter after Sunday's 2-0 derby win over Lazio, but Garcia admits it's no longer a two-horse

"Inter and Napoli are both very strong this year, but you can't forget about Juventus, either," he said. Juve coach Massimiliano Allegri admits his side now have to go "step by step" to revive their title hopes. If Napoli end their 25-year-wait for the league title, it would be the story of the season.

Naples-born Sarri failed to make the grade in top level football and became a banker, but regularly swapped his shirt and tie after office hours for the tracksuit that has since become his trademark to coach. He worked his way up the ladder. led Empoli into Serie A last season and made such a good impression he hit the jackpot by replacing Rafael Benitez when he left Napoli.—AFP

US BANS UNDER 10s FROM **HEADING OVER SAFETY FEARS**

LOS ANGELES: Football players under the age of 10 will be banned from heading as part of a series of safety measures aimed at tackling head injuries in the sport, the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) has announced, ending the threat of a proposed class-action lawsuit.

The revised safety measures will also limit the amount of headers in practice for players aged between 11 and 13, a statement on the US Soccer website confirmed.

The new rules will be followed strictly by USSF Soccer youth national teams and the youth sections of Major League Soccer teams but are only recommendations for teams and associations outside US Soccer control.

The guidelines were drawn up to resolve a legal case launched in federal court in California by a group of parents and players alleging not enough was being done to treat and monitor head

No damages were sought in the suit, only amendments to rules governing the sport in the United States.

As part of the resolution, the USSF has developed an extensive program to improve concussion awareness and education amongst youth coaches, referees, parents and players, a statement said. Rules governing the maximum number of substitutions would also be tweaked to ensure they did not act as an impediment to the evaluation of players who have suffered a concussion during

"In constructing the concussion component, US Soccer sought input from its medical science committee which includes experts in the field of concussion diagnosis and management, as well as from its technical advisors, and worked with its youth members to develop a true consensus-based program," US Soccer chief executive Dan Flynn said in a statement.

Steve Berman, lead counsel for the plaintiffs, said the new safety measures met the objectives of the case, which would now be dropped.

"We are pleased that we were able to play a role in improving the safety of the sport for soccer-playing children in this country," he said. A recent study by scientists in Denver looked at concussions in US high school soccer between 2005 and 2014. The study reported that while rules outlawing heading would likely reduce the number of concussions, the main causes of head injuries involved athlete-to-athlete contact. — AFP

NEYMAR, RODRIGUEZ, CAVANI BACK FOR WC

SAO PAULO: Neymar, James Rodriguez and Edinson Cavani return to the international fold this week as Brazil try to extend Argentina's winless run in World Cup qualifying while Ecuador meet Uruguay in a table-topping clash.

Neymar and Cavani were banned for violent conduct at this year's Copa America and Brazil have stuttered without their tal-

They were knocked out of the Copa in the quarter-finals by Paraguay and looked toothless when losing their opening World Cup qualifier 2-0 in Chile.

Brazil bounced back to beat Venezuela 3-1 but will be relieved to have Neymar back for Thursday night's 'classico' in Buenos Aires. The Brazilians won the corresponding fixture with ease last time and Dunga, who coached them to that 3-1 win in Rosario, is under pressure to produce a settled side that plays attractive football.

He will be aided not just by Neymar's return but by the home side's problems. Argentina have picked up one point from their first two qualifiers and will be without Lionel Messi, Sergio Aguero and Carlos

Uruguay have Paris St Germain striker Cavani back against Ecuador on Thursday after a two-game ban and are looking to maintain a good run.

The Uruguayans beat Bolivia away and Colombia at home in the first two qualifiers, their best start for years.

NO SUAREZ

They are again without Luis Suarez who is still serving a ban for biting Giorgio Chiellini in the 2014 World Cup. Abel Hernandez or Diego Rolan will therefore partner Cavani up front. Ecuador are the surprise team of the competition, having beaten Argentina 2-0 in Buenos Aires and Bolivia at home by the same scoreline.

However, they are missing four top players in attacking midfielders Michael Arroyo and Renato Ibarra and English Premier League pair Enner Valencia and Antonio Valencia. "We've been a bit unlucky with injuries to players who can all play in the same position," said coach Gustavo Quinteros as he named Jaime Ayovi and Jonathan Gonzales as replacements.

"I think the men we have can replace them with no problems." Among the other players returning is Real Madrid's Rodriguez who will go to Santiago with Colombia on Thursday to face a Chile side that is one of only three teams to have won both matches.

The Copa America champions will be at full strength but Rodriguez's presence is balanced out by the loss of their top scorer Radamel Falcao. Felipe Pardo has been called up for the first time.

Bottom teams Bolivia and Venezuela meet in La Paz on Thursday while Peru, the third nation yet to win a point, take on Paraguay in Lima on Friday. — Reuters

SAMPDORIA SACK ZENGA: OFFICIAL

MILAN: Serie A side Sampdoria have announced the sacking of coach Walter Zenga amid reports former Fiorentina handler Vincenzo Montella will take over at the Luigi Ferraris stadium. Sampdoria dropped to 10th place in Serie A, 11 points behind leaders Fiorentina, following a 2-0 home defeat by La Viola on Sunday. It was Samp's first home defeat of the season and after fans called for Zenga's sacking at the final whistle, club president Massimo Ferrero

obliged on Tuesday. A club statement said: "Sampdoria announces that Walter Zenga has been relieved of his duties as first team coach. "President Massimo Ferrero and the club are disappointed this relationship came to an end prematurely and wish Walter Zenga all the very best for the future."

Zenga's sacking came after the former Italy goalkeeper, known as L'Uomo Ragno (Spider Man) in his playing days, travelled to Dubai for a short holiday on Monday

without telling club officials.

Italian media reports quoted Zenga as saying he had no ill feeling towards the club, for whom he played from 1994 to 1996, having spent the bulk of his career with Inter Milan.

"I don't feel betrayed, I'm happy I had the chance to coach a team that I also played for in the past," said Zenga. "When you're a coach, you expect to constantly come under scrutiny. It's part of the game."

Montella, sacked by Fiorentina at the tail end of last season, is now tipped to take over with reports claiming Ferrero is negotiating with the Florence-based club, with whom Montella still has a contract until

Zenga's sacking was the second to come in Serie A yesterday, during the break for international football, following Palermo's announcement that Giuseppe lachini had been sacked and replaced by Davide Ballardini. —AFP

Pressure grows on Beckenbauer IN 2006 WORLD CUP SCANDAL

BERLIN: Franz Beckenbauer is under growing pressure to explain his part in Germany's 2006 World Cup scandal amidst reports of a document pointing the finger at the legendary player and coach. German football has lurched into a crisis over magazine Spiegel's report last month alleging that the votes of four members of FIFA's executive committee were bought in 2000, when Germany narrowly won the vote to host the 2006 finals.

At the centre of the scandal is a 6.7 millioneuro (\$7.2m) payment, which is alleged to have been used to purchase the support of FIFA's executive committee.

The scandal took a dramatic twist last week when police carried out raids at the Frankfurt headquarters of the German Football Association (DFB) and led to Wolfgang Niersbach resigning as DFB president on Monday. State prosecutors have revealed three men-including Niersbach, ex-DFB president Theo Zwanziger and ex-general secretary Horst Schmidt-are being investigated for serious tax fraud surrounding the FIFA payment. Despite his pivotal position in the 2006 World Cup-first in leading the successful bid and later as chairman of the tournament's organising committee — Beckenbauer, 70, has stayed tight-lipped in the last fortnight, even as Niersbach took "political responsibility" in resigning as DFB boss. But now German daily Bild claims to have seen a draft agreement, signed in part by Beckenbauer, which it says was aimed at "buying votes for the German bid".

Munich-based Sueddeutsche Zeitung also quoted sources having seen the same document, reportedly signed in July 2000, just four days before Germany beat South Africa by 12 votes to 11 for the right to host the 2006 World Cup finals. Beckenbauer is already being investigated by FIFA's ethics committee, which is looking into the controversial awarding of the 2018 and 2022 World Cup finals to Russia and Qatar respectively.

But 'the Kaiser' is under increasing pressure to shed some light on the 2006 World Cup scandal in Germany. "I expect those who can contribute to the cleaning up, to do so," said Germany's Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere on Tuesday.

'Shock and dismay'

The Kitzbuehel-based agency representing Beckenbauer refused to comment yesterday to

SID, an AFP subsidiary, but last month the German legend admitted making a "mistake" in the bidding process.

"In order to obtain a FIFA grant, we accepted a proposition coming from FIFA's finance commission that the implicated parties should, in retrospect, have refused," said the 'Kaiser', who captained the West Germany team that won the 1974 World Cup and then coached the side that won the trophy in 1990. "As president of the organising committee at that time, I take responsibility for this mistake."

Niersbach has said the 6.7 million-euro payment was to obtain a FIFA grant to fund the 2006 World Cup finals and insisted "votes were not bought and there was no slush fund". Vicepresidents Reinhard Rauball and Rainer Koch will now take over as interim co-chiefs of the

Ex-Germany striker Oliver Bierhoff, 47, has ruled himself out of the running to replace Niersbach as head of the German FA, but said news of the resignation had stunned the team who are preparing for Friday's friendly against France in Paris.

"It's not a subject for me, I am helping to prepare the Germany team for the 2016 European Championship and have an academy project. which I am enthusiastic about," said Bierhoff on Tuesday in Munich. "It's been an intensive three weeks for everyone at the DFB. "Even if you had counted on the fact that anything can happen, we're still shocked and affected by news of (Niersbach's) resignation.

"There is respect for him taking political responsibility, but also dismay, as it's no secret that Wolfgang Niersbach had a particularly close relationship with the squad." —AFP

WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO CHELSEA'S DIEGO COSTA?

LONDON: Diego Costa has turned into a pale imitation of the player who took the Premier League by storm last year and Chelsea must get him firing on all cylinders again to have any hope of salvaging their wretched season. The 27-yearold striker could scarcely have believed his luck when he discovered last week that he had been recalled to Spain's squad for the friendlies with England in Alicante on Friday and Belgium in Brussels four days later. He has scored only three times in 15 appearances for his club this season and the swashbuckling, battering ram of a centre forward who notched 20 league goals for the champions last term appears but a distant memory. Chelsea fans, already mystified by their team's dramatic loss of form, are now wondering what has happened to Diego Costa.

Although the Londoners slumped to their third straight league defeat at Stoke City on Saturday, they produced a much-improved performance that suggested some key players are beginning to find form after a torrid start to the campaign. Eden Hazard, the 2014-15 Premier League Player of the Year, again showed the tricky, ball-playing skills that tormented defences last season but more often than not, Chelsea's attacks petered out when the ball went to Costa. Former Newcastle United target man Alan Shearer, a lethal international striker for England in his prime, said the temperamental Costa could learn a lot from Leicester City's red-hot marksman Jamie Vardy.

Vardy has netted in each of his last nine league appearances and will equal the 2003 record of former Manchester United and Netherlands striker Ruud van Nistelrooy if he scores in Leicester's next game at Newcastle on Nov. 21. "Right now one (Vardy) looks full of energy while the other (Costa) is barely mobile," said Shearer.

LACK OF MOVEMENT

"I studied Chelsea's performance on Saturday and actually thought they played as well as they have done for some time. What frustrated me about Costa was the lack of trouble he gave Stoke's back four."

Shearer, who scored 30 goals in 63 matches

for England, bemoaned Costa's lack of movement. "Costa is constantly coming towards the ball now whereas you look at Vardy and he is always looking to run in behind the back four," he

said. "If you have Costa's ability there is only one place you should be, up front, facing defenders and running on to through balls."

Costa looks to be spending more time winding up opposition defenders than getting into the penalty box and if his barren run in front of goal continues, Chelsea may have little option but to seek a replacement in the January transfer window. Jose Mourinho has received constant criticism for a remarkable slump in form that has seen Chelsea slump to fifth from bottom with 11 points from 12 league matches. For someone who has shown little patience with managers in the past, owner Roman Abramovich appears keen to give Stamford Bridge hero Mourinho every chance to pull his team round. The Portuguese will now be keeping his fingers crossed that Costa can get back on the goal trail with Spain over the next few days. — Reuters

CUTLER RALLIES BEARS TO WIN OVER CHARGERS

CHICAGO: Trailing by nine points after three quarters, the Chicago Bears rallied to beat San Diego 22-19 on Monday, handing the Chargers (2-7) a fifth consecutive

Chicago (3-5) quarterback Jay Cutler hit tight end Zach Miller for a 25-yard touchdown with 3:19 left, and running back Jeremy Langford rushed over for the two-point conversion to open up the three-point cushion, the Bears' first lead of the night. The Chargers' skid is their longest since they dropped six in a row in 2011.

Culter completed 27 of 40 passes for 345 yards and two touchdowns. He also lost a fumble and was intercepted once. Bears receiver Alshon Jeffery caught 10 passes for 151 yards. Chargers quarterback Philip Rivers was 26-for-42 passes for 280 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions. It was the first time he did not throw for at least 300 yards in six games. San Diego running back Danny Woodhead produced 111 total yards and a touchdown.

Kicker Josh Lambo's second field goal, this one from 22 yards, increased the Chargers' lead to 19-14 with eight minutes to play. Before Lambo's kick, San Diego had a touchdown pass from Rivers to tight end Antonio Gates wiped away when right guard D.J. Fluker was flagged for being downfield. The Bears pulled within 16-14 with 14 minutes remaining on Langford's one-yard touchdown run. It capped a 93-yard, 15-play drive in which Chicago converted four third downs, the final one on rookie Langford's score.

Lambo's 31-yard field goal in the half's waning seconds pushed the Chargers' advantage to 16-7. The Bears sliced their deficit to 13-7 when Cutler clicked with tight end Martellus Bennett on a 1-yard pass midway through the second guarter.

Earlier in the quarter, Chicago cornerback Tracy Porter stripped wide receiver Dontrelle Inman of the ball, and it was recovered by linebacker Christian Jones, with the Bears taking over at the San Diego 41-yard line.

Two plays later, though, cornerback Jason Verrett went 68 yards for a pick-six and a 13-0 Chargers advantage. Lambo missed the point after. It was Verrett's first touchdown and second interception of his career off Cutler's second turnover of the first half.

The Bears appeared poised to score late in the first quarter, when they advanced to the Chargers' 10-yard line. However, Chicago retreated 5 yards on an offside penalty, then linebacker Melvin Ingram sacked Cutler and forced a fumble, which was recovered by safety Eric Weddle. The Chargers weren't able to convert the turnover into points.

The Chargers struck first after Gould was wide left on a 47-yard field goal attempt to end the game's first possession. Gould also missed from 34 yards in the third quarter. Rivers found Woodhead for a 14-yard scoring pass and a 7-0 lead. Woodhead ran a wheel route from the left side of the formation and was wide open for the score as the Bears bungled their zone coverage. — Reuters

RUSSIA RESPONDS AS DOPING SCANDAL THREATENS TO SPREAD

MOSCOW: Russia rejected yesterday explosive accusations of doping and corruption and promised a rapid response to avoid suspension from the 2016 Olympics due to the scandal that threatens to spread far beyond the borders of Russia and athletics.

"Until any proof has been put forward it is hard to accept any accusations as they seem rather groundless," Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov stated. Meanwhile, the Moscow antidoping laboratory was stripped of its accreditation by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) in the first concrete measure taken since the publishing of a damning report by a WADA independent commission.

Athletics was rocked by allegations of Russian "state-sponsored" doping contained in the report published on Monday. IAAF president Sebastian Coe has given the Russian athletics federation (ARAF) "until the end of the week" to respond or risk possible suspension. Despite the Kremlin's dismissive reaction, ARAF assured Coe that it would contact the IAAF "in the very near future" outlining its anti-doping programme and "its reaction to the

deductions and conclusions" in WADA's report. Calls for Russia, fourth in the 2012 London Olympics medal table, to be banned from next year's Olympic Games are growing. UK Athletics chief Ed Warner told BBC Radio 4: "Lord Coe... says that his (IAAF) council is meeting on Friday or Saturday to consider sanctioning Russia and possibly to suspend them. My strong advice would be: you've absolutely got to do that."

That view was echoed by Australia's national Olympic Committee. "We would very much support Russian track and field athletes not being allowed to compete in Rio if their federation is not code-compliant to WADA," the 2016 Australian Olympic team's chef de mission Kitty Chiller said in Sydney. "If Russia is not in Rio, I think the reputation of athletics will be enhanced because the public will know every athlete competing is clean and is competing in the true spirit of the Olympic Games." The crisis engulfing the sport long-viewed as the flagship of the Olympic Games comes hot on the heels of FIFA's own corruption turmoil. And worryingly according to WADA, the athletics scandal is by no means confined to Russia nor athletics.

"Russia is not the only country, nor athletics the only sport, facing the problem of orchestrated doping in sport," the report, triggered by German broadcaster ARD's documentary last December, warned. WADA's independent commission chairman Dick Pound added: "We certainly do not think that Russia is the only country with a doping problem and we don't think athletics is the only sport with a doping problem. "It seems pretty clear from both the ARD programme and subsequent developments that Kenya has a real problem. It's been very slow to acknowledge that there is a problem."

"If they don't do a good job (investigating doping) then I think somebody else will do a job for them." According to several anti-doping specialists, the risk of abuse is especially high in countries with strong rulers.

"Frauds like this can only be State-run with secret service involvement," a specialist who wished to remain anonymous told AFP. He raised the case of China, recalling that in the build-up to the 2008 Beijing Olympics a German reporter posed as a swimming coach in search of finding ways to improve performance. — AFP

OIL PRICE SLUMP A 'WAKE-UP CALL': LAGARDE

OIL MAJORS SEE LOW PRICES PERSISTING FOR MONTHS AHEAD

DOHA: The head of the International Monetary Fund said yesterday that the global slump in oil prices was a "splendid wake-up call" for energy-producing countries to restructure their economies. Speaking at Georgetown University in major gas producer Qatar, Christine Lagarde said those countries reliant on oil and gas revenues had to change to maintain their economic position.

"I would say the current situation is a splendid wake-up call to restructure," she said. "In the face of this new situation, triggered by the price of the oil which we see as not a short-term phenomenon but a longer-term phenomenon... measures have to be taken." Lagarde said those measures included finding new sources of revenue and tax, and keeping a tight control on spending.

Although not specifically mentioning any countries, she also encouraged more private sector involvement. "How do you welcome the private sector, how do you make the environment more business friendly so that the private sector feels welcome and encouraged and takes the baton from the public sector," she said. "So, it's a whole series of measures that

need to be considered."

Lagarde delivered a similar message to ministers of the six Gulf Cooperation Council states — Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates as well as Qatar, on Sunday.

The IMF projects that growth in the GCC states will fall from 3.2 percent this year to 2.7 percent in 2016. It forecasts that export revenues will be \$275 billion (256 billion euros) lower this year than in 2014. The price of oil has dropped by more than half since the beginning of last year.

Oil glut to persisit

The global oil glut is likely to take longer than expected to clear and may depress oil prices for many more months if not years despite steep investment cuts and project cancellations around the world, executives from oil majors said yesterday. The views from the top ranks of Exxon Mobil, BP and Total were given at an industry conference in Abu Dhabi as key officials from the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) said they expect better prices in 2016. The

discord in views comes as most global majors are slashing their budgets and investments with the aim to be able to generate cashflows with prices as low as \$60 per barrel.

And while major producing nations are also reducing spending, they are often facing much tougher choices to keep governments popular. "I'm not sure we will exit from low prices before many months," Total's chief executive Patrick Pouyanne told the conference.

Oil prices more than halved in the past 18 months because of a global oil glut which arose on the back of a US shale oil boom and a decision by OPEC not to cut output to fight for market share with higher cost producers.

BP's and Exxon Mobil's heads of exploration and production Lamar Mckey and Jack Williams both said low oil prices would stay for a while and BP's head of the Middle East Michael Townshend said the group saw oil fluctuating around \$60 per barrel for the next 3 years.

The views are more pessimistic than those of OPEC with secretary general Abdullah Al-Badri saying yesterday he saw a positive momentum for oil markets building in 2016. The glut

is persisting even though oil majors alone have cut their capital investments by a combined \$22 billion this year while scrapping some 80 projects, double the number abandoned in 2014, according to Mckay.

Townshend said he saw Iraq - a major source of additional supply over the past two years - unlikely to be adding to the glut next year. "It is difficult to see a massive ramp up in production next year because of the way the contracts are structured," he said referring to ongoing talks with the government of Iraq about lower investment plans for next year to reduce paybacks to oil majors and thus leave more money for the large hudget.

But as the oil industry becomes more efficient it is quickly learning how to recover more resources from existing fields. "The new reality is that giant fields will produce for much longer," said Mckay.

Williams said his example of rising efficiencies was the cost of well drilling in North Dakota - one of the key US states behind the shale boom - being down 36 percent in the past four years while generating higher production. — Agencies

SAUDI AIMS FOR FIRST FOREIGN BOND AS SOON AS NEXT YEAR

DUBAI: Saudi Arabia aims to start selling bonds in the international market as soon as next year as it seeks new ways to cover a budget deficit caused by low oil prices, banking industry sources said yesterday. The sources, who have been discussing the matter with officials in the central bank, the Saudi Arabian Monetary Agency (SAMA), said authorities had not yet finalised the plan but were making progress.

"If it's going to be January, June or 2017, I'm not sure," said a senior Gulf banker, declining to be named because of commercial sensitivities. "But it's something that's top of their minds."

A Saudi commercial banker said bankers were pitching to both the finance ministry and SAMA.

"The ministry ... is borrowing but SAMA would be the issuer. In my opinion, I don't think there will be a mandate till next year," he said.

The Saudi central bank and finance ministry did not respond to requests for comment. In July, the government began issuing about 20 billion riyals (\$5.3 billion) of domestic bonds every month - its first sovereign bond sales since 2007 to help fund its deficit, which has widened as the price of crude has shed more than half its value since June 2014.

The International Monetary Fund estimates the shortfall in the public accounts of the world's biggest oil exporter is now running at over \$100 billion annually.

But the domestic bond issues have started pushing up Saudi money market rates by draining liquidity from banks. International bonds, which foreign banks have been pitching since

early 2015 to manage, could relieve some of this pressure.

MAJOR SHIFT

An international debt program would be a major policy shift by Riyadh, which has been very conservative towards bonds in recent years. Public debt dropped to a miniscule 1.6 percent of gross domestic product at the end of last year.

The IMF estimates this figure will rise to 44 percent by 2020. The Saudi government has been discussing creating a debt management office to handle issues, the sources said. The Gulf banker said Saudi Arabia's first international issue would be a test case so would probably have a maturity of around 10 years. After that, it might consider longer maturities such as 30 years.

The initial issue would likely be in the region of \$1 billion to \$2 billion, he added. "There's not a number we have discussed but they would be looking at a substantial benchmark size...

The most they would be able to tap the international market would be two or four times a year," he added. Last month, Standard & Poor's cut its sovereign long-term ratings for Saudi Arabia to 'A-plus/A-1', citing low oil prices.

But at present only a few Saudi entities, mostly state-linked ones such as utility Saudi Electricity Co, have outstanding foreign bonds. So bankers believe Saudi sovereign debt would find a market. "Any issue would be significantly tighter than Bahrain and look more like Qatar or Abu Dhabi," the Gulf banker said of the bonds' expected price range. — Reuters

CFC POSTS KD 6M IN 9-MONTH PROFITS

KUWAIT: The Commercial Facilities Company (CFC) said yesterday that its net profits reached KD six million (\$19.7 million), 12 fils per share, in first nine months of 2015, compared to KD 9.1 million same period in in 2014. Total shareholders' equity reached KD 165.5 million in the first nine months of 2015, compared to KD 168.1 million the same period last year, CFC said in statement posted on Kuwait Stock Exchange (KSE) website. Overall assets reached KD 321 million, total liabilities amounted to KD 155. 4 million in the first nine months of 2015, compared to KD 122 million in the same period last year. The company was founded in 1977 and was listed in the KSE in 1984, with a paid-up capital of KD 53.6 million.

Agility earns KD 39.07 million

KUWAIT: Agility Public Warehousing Company (Agility) earned KD 39.07 million, 33.9 fils per share, in first nine months of 2015, as compared to KD 37.14 million, 32 fils per share, same period of last year, rising by approximately four percent. The company said in a statement yesterday that the earnings were posted due to operations' improvement, adding that overall revenues amounted to KD 5. 2 million and spending KD 614,000. Agility was established with a KD 121.18 million capital in 1979. It was enlisted in the KSE in 1984.

Imtiaz earns KD 8.8m

KUWAIT: Al-Imtiaz Investment Company earned KD 8.8 million, 8.1 fils per share, in the first nine months ending on September 30, 2015, compared to KD two million, 0.92 fils per share, the same period of 2014. The company said in a statement yesterday that shareholders' equity amounted to approximately KD 178.1 million in contrast to KD 172.2 million, also comparing the two periods. Assets reached KD 289.6 million, liabilities some KD 75 million in contrast to KD 104.9 million, also comparing the two periods. The company was established in 2005 and was enlisted in the Kuwaiti bourse in 2011, with a paid-up capital of KD 113.3 million. It invests in property, industries and agriculture.

Kuwait oil price drops 79 cents to \$39.82pb

KUWAIT: Kuwait oil price dropped 79 cents on Monday reaching \$39.82 per barrel as compared to \$40.61 pb on Friday, Kuwait Petroleum Corporation said yesterday. In global oil markets, oil prices fell about one percent yesterday (Sunday), continuing bearish trend for the fourth consecutive day, due to the increase in US oil stocks and expected high record output by Russia and Saudi Arabia. Likewise, the Brent Blend shed 23 cents dropping to \$47.19 pb, as well as the American crude which lost 42 cents, settling at \$43.87 pb.

US dollar stable against dinar at KD 0.303

KUWAIT: The US dollar was stable vis-a-vis the Kuwaiti dinar exchanging at KD 0.303 yesterday whereas the euro went down to KD 0.326 as compared to Monday's rates, the Central Bank of Kuwait said. The Sterling pound rose to KD 0.459 and the Swiss franc to KD 0.302 while the Japanese

CONTINUED OIL SUPPLY GLUT KEEPS PRICES SUPPRESSED

nternational oil prices remained relatively range-bound during October. On average, ICE Brent, the global benchmark crude, traded within the \$48-50.0 per barrel (bbl) band for the second month in a row, while West Texas Intermediate (WTI), the US marker, settled within the \$45-47/bbl range during the month. Both crudes closed the month just over a dollar higher than they started, with Brent settling at \$49.5/bbl and WTI at \$46.6/bbl.

Nevertheless, concerns over burgeoning crude oil supplies and surging crude and refined products stock continued to weigh heavily on oil markets in October. Despite a brief rally around the 6th of the month, when ICE Brent and NYMEX WTI hit \$53.1/bbl and \$49.6/bbl, respectively, on lower expectations of US output and forecasts that the oil market could rebalance in 2016, oil market fundamentals remained weak. OECD commercial oil inventories continued to swell amid higher refinery runs, reaching 2.9 billion barrels in August, according to data released by the nternational Energy Agency (IEA).

Crude oil stocks in particular remain at record levels, while global inventories of refined products, such as diesel, stand close to maximum storage capacity. The incentive for continued stock builds is, therefore, likely to decline, putting further pressure on crude prices. And while the onset of the autumn refinery maintenance season should see pressure on stock levels of refined products ease, lower refinery runs could see crude inventories fill up once more, compounding the bearish outlook for oil prices.

Consensus forecasts for oil prices over the next few years have been lowered, echoing the trend in the futures market. With Brent currently averaging \$55.9/bbl for the year as a whole, most analysts expect the oil price to remain at the lower end of the \$54-\$64.0/bbl range next year before rising slowly towards the upper limit in 2017 as the demandsupply mismatch begins to unwind more significantly. Indeed, after accounting for a projected slowdown in demand growth next year and the potential arrival of additional barrels of oil from Iran once sanctions are lifted, the IEA predicts that equilibrium would be restored later than the previous forecast of 402016. Informing its decision to revise its estimate of global demand

growth next year downward to 1.2 million barrels per day (mb/d) from 1.3 mb/d in its last report, the IEA is taking its cue from the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) recently released World Economic Outlook. The IMF foresees a slightly weaker-thanexpected global recovery in 2015 and 2016 on account of a more pronounced slowdown in emerging markets, especially China. The boost to the economy from lower oil prices is also expected to disappear next year.

OPEC oil output

OPEC oil production in September, led by an increase of 80,000 b/d in Iraqi output, reached a three-and-a-half-year high of 31.6 mb/d, according to OPEC data obtained from secondary sources. (Charts 6 & 7.) This would make September the fifth consecutive month that output has topped 31.0 mb/d and the fifteenth consecutive month that output has exceeded the oil exporting group's 30.0 mb/d official ceiling. As mentioned above, Iraq recorded notable gains in output to reach near record levels of 4.1 mb/d in September. This was largely due to the resumption of oil exports from the country's north after previously sabotaged pipelines to Turkey were repaired. Meanwhile, federal oil fields in the south continue to pump at record levels. Iraq's production, which includes oil from Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) areas, has surged by 25 percent, or 820,000 b/d, during the last year. This is the world's fastest source of supply growth. What's more, this is coming against a backdrop of elevated security risks, with Baghdad continuing the fight against Islamic State (IS), which still controls between a quarter and a third of Iraqi territory.


Meanwhile, crude output from OPEC's largest producer. Saudi Arabia, continued to top 10.0 mb/d in September, despite dropping by 50.000 b/d during the month. Coming off the peak summer energy demand season, production has fallen for three consecutive months and yet still remains near record levels. The kingdom has not shown any indication that it intends to alter its strategy of defending market share and support oil prices by cutting output. In fact, it continues to discount the price of its crude to Asian customers as it faces increasing competition from both OPEC and non-OPEC producers. Oil production from the


kingdom's GCC neighbors, Kuwait, the UAE and Qatar, continued at pretty much a steady level, although Abu Dhabi looks to be at a more advanced stage than its counterparts

recover from the loss of at least 250,000 b/d in crude output from the partitioned Neutral Zone by ramping up production from some of its other fields. The authorities remain com-

in attaining its official production capacity target of 3.5 mb/d by 2017 through investment spending. UAE output reached a record 2.9 mb/d in September.

Kuwaiti production continued to edge slowly upwards in September, to an average of 2.7 mb/d during the month. The country is aiming to mitted, despite the drop in oil prices, to investing in oil infrastructure and enhanced oil recovery (EOR) techniques in order to reach their production capacity target of 4.0 mb/d by 2020.

Iranian output also remained steady in September, at 2.85 mb/d. Iran's potential return to the oil mar-

kets in early 2016 (assuming the country complies with IAEA inspections and sanctions are lifted), with probably an additional 500,000 b/d within 6 months, is the largest source of downside risk to oil prices next year. The Iranian authorities anticipate that production would reach 2011's, pre-sanctions, level of 3.6 mb/d almost immediately. That would imply an extra 750,000 b/d over current output hitting international markets during 1Q16. This amount seems optimistic, even accounting for the 40 million barrels (60 percent of which the IEA estimates is condensates) Iran could access quite quickly from storage aboard its fleet of very large crude carriers (VLCCs).

Non-OPEC supply growth

While OPEC output remains stubbornly high in the face of low prices, non-OPEC supply growth is finally showing signs of slowing down. US oil production, which has been the largest source of non-OPEC supply growth in recent years, thanks to the shale oil revolution, has clearly declined over the last 6 months. Cutbacks in capital spending by oil majors and reductions in drilling activity are beginning to take their toll. According to weekly data provided by the US Energy Information Administration (EIA), US output had fallen from 9.6 mb/d in early June, which was a 44-year high, to 9.1 mb/d by the 23 October, a drop of 500,000 b/d, or 5 percent. While US supply growth is still up on a yearon-year basis, by 1.6 percent, expected further declines in the number of oil drilling rigs-rig counts are down by more than 60 percent in 2015-and the prospect of US banks reevaluating credit lines to cash flow-constrained shale operators, may push annual growth into negative territory over the next few months. The IEA expects non-OPEC supply

in 2016 to fall by 0.5 mb/d in 2016, with the US, Russia and Norway among the largest oil producers expected to witness declines in output as a result of lower oil prices and spending cuts. For 2016, the combination of declining non-OPEC supply and healthier albeit softening demand growth should raise the 'call on OPEC crude and stock change, the amount of oil that OPEC needs to produce to balance the market, to 31.1 mb/d, from an expected 29.7 mb/d in 2015.

Al-Baraka Banking Group Q3 profit up

DUBAI: Al-Baraka Banking Group , the Bahraini Islamic lender with operations in more than a dozen countries, posted a 4 percent increase in third-quarter net income yesterday. The bank, which has operations across the Middle East, Asia and Africa, made a net attributable profit of \$36 million for the three months ending Sept. 30, it said in a statement. This compares with a profit of \$35 million in the corresponding period of 2014. Total assets stood at \$24 billion as of Sept. 30, up 2 percent from the end of 2014.

Egyptian pound steady at dollar sale

CAIRO: The Egyptian pound was stable at a dollar sale yesterday, with the central bank selling \$40 million at a cut-off price of 7.9301 pounds per dollar, while the currency weakened on the parallel market. The official cut-off price was unchanged from Sunday's dollar sale, but two traders said the dollar changed hands at 8.6 pounds in the parallel market yesterday, compared with 8.50 pounds on Sunday. "There is demand for dollars from gold shops because gold prices dropped so they are seizing the opportunity to buy gold at low prices. The price went down by 7.5 percent in 10 days," one banker said. Egypt announced in October that Hesham Ramez would be replaced as central bank governor this month by senior banker Tarek Amer. The move was welcomed by traders, who expect a new approach to the country's currency crisis.

Abu Dhabi gas firm plans expansion

ABU DHABI: Abu Dhabi Gas Liquefaction (ADGAS) said yesterday it expects to complete expansion of its natural gas processing facilities by mid-2018 to help meet rising local demand. The project will develop and expand facilities to boost gas transfer from offshore to onshore as part of the UAE's plans to meet demand in the Gulf state. ADGAS said the expansion project at Das Island will add around 400 million cubic feet of gas per day to the current 1 billion cubic feet per day from the offshore fields. It would also include extending an offshore pipeline. Staterun Abu Dhabi Gas Industries Co (GASCO) and ADGAS said in February they had awarded about \$1.6 billion worth of contracts for the project. ADGAS, majority-owned by Abu Dhabi National Oil Co (ADNOC), said last year that it planned to increase gas production to as much as 2.4 billion standard cubic feet (scf) per day by 2017, from 2 billion

EGYT FALLS, AUSTERITY WORRIES HIT QATAR

MIDEAST STOCK MARKETS

DUBAI: Egypt's stock market dropped sharply for a third straight day yesterday because of speculation about a possible currency devaluation or rise in local interest rates. Gulf markets fell, with Qatar hit by concern about looming austerity policies. The Egyptian index tumbled 4.4 percent to 6,825 points, bringing its losses in the past three trading days to 9.5 percent. It broke through technical support at its September low; the next support is its August low of 6,641 points.

Strong US economic data on Friday raised expectations for a US rate hike next month. Meanwhile, the Russian airliner crash in the Sinai threatens to slash Egyptian tourism revenues. With sagging foreign exchange reserves, Egypt is in poor shape to cope with either threat. Its debt

insurance costs surged to 18-month highs on Monday and its dollar bond prices fell sharply. Two more Egyptian state banks said yesterday they were raising interest rates on their three-year savings certificates to 12.5 percent from 10 percent, bringing the number of banks doing this to four. Investors think this could be a prelude to a devaluation, a domestic interest rate rise or possibly both. The central bank has not clarified its intentions, leaving investors uncertain.

Property firm Palm Hills Development plunged 6.3 percent and investment firm Qalaa Holdings lost 4.4 percent. Commercial and International Bank sank 6.2 percent. There were rises for a few companies that might benefit from a weaker currency. Exporter Suez Cement gained 3.5

percent while Alexandria Container and Cargo Handling Co rose 6.2 percent after a 10 percent leap on Monday.

GULF

Qatar, usually among the most stable of Gulf markets, dropped 2.0 percent in a broad-based sell-off. Petrochemicals and metals producer Industries Qatar sank 2.4 percent. Saleh Mohammed Al-Nabit, Qatar's Minister of Development Planning and Statistics, said in a speech on Monday that the government must urgently consider reforms to its subsidy and tax systems in light of low oil and gas prices. He also said the government had to be more disciplined in spending. Wealthy Qatar is in no danger of running out of money, but top officials' comments since last week have

pointed to a new mood of austerity.

Other Gulf markets were depressed by low oil prices and weak global equities. The Saudi index dropped 0.4 percent, although miner Ma'aden stood out, climbing 3.0 percent. Dubai's stock index dropped 2.4 percent as Emaar Properties fell 3.7 percent. Abu Dhabi lost 0.6 percent as Aldar Properties sank 2.6 percent, despite reporting a 9.4 percent rise in third-quarter net profit to 634.3 million dirhams (\$172.7 million), beating SICO Bahrain's forecast of 490.7 million dirhams.

In Kuwait, logistics giant Agility climbed 2.0 percent after reporting a 5 percent rise in third-quarter net profit to KD13.7 million (\$45.1 million); SICO Bahrain had forecast KD12.7 million. Kuwait's stock index was almost flat. — Reuters

CHINA DATA SHOWS RISING DEFLATIONARY PRESSURE

BEIJING/SHANGHAI: China's October inflation data showed persisting if not intensifying deflationary pressure, spurring analysts to expect more moves to stimulate the slowing economy by year-end. The October consumer price index (CPI) cooled more than expected, rising 1.3 percent from a year earlier. compared with 1.6 percent in September, National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) data showed yesterday. A Reuters poll expected a 1.5 percent rise.

The producer price index (PPI) fell 5.9 percent in October from a year earlier, equal to the September decline and slightly worse than economists' forecasts of a 5.8 percent drop.

On a monthly basis, consumer prices fell 0.3 percent, compared with a 0.1 percent increase in September. Analysts agreed the weak inflation readings raised the odds of further stimulus soon, but were divided on whether that meant further rate cuts, greater fiscal outlays or both.

"While it is rational to argue China should ease monetary policy further, China appears to intend to stimulate demand via more proactive fiscal policy," wrote Zhou Hao, senior emerging markets economist at Commerzbank in Singapore. "Further cut in policy rates before the end of this year might be difficult especially as Fed is about to hike. The recent statement by deputy minister also indicates that China will do more on fiscal side in the coming year."

On Friday, Caixin Magazine quoted China's vice minister of finance indicating a fiscal deficit of 3 percent, well above the current planned 2.3 percent for 2015, might still be considered within a safe range. China is already in its biggest

easing cycle since the height of the financial crisis, but low inflation means that real interest rates remain high for many firms, especially manufacturers who have endured years of falling factory gate prices.

The central bank has cut benchmark interest six times since November 2014 and repeatedly reduced banks' reserve requirement ratio. Yesterday's weak inflation print continues a well-established trend of falling producer prices and tepid consumer price rises, in part a result of sharply lower commodity prices in 2015 but also reflecting slowing demand growth for many goods.

PROBLEM OF OVERCAPACITY

"The PPI data continued to point out weak domestic demand and the overcapacity problem in the real economy," said Li Huiyong, an economist at Shenyin & Wanguo Securities in Shanghai. "We think the government needs to step in to intervene with more support as the outlook of the economy is not so optimistic. We expect more interest rates and RRR cuts in coming months."

Heavy industrial firms and miners, hit by an extended slump in the real estate sector which drives final demand for many of their products, have fared particularly poorly. The Luan Group, a state coal miner, said last month it had no choice but to cut output and put workers on extended unpaid leave. Although consumer price inflation in China is highly seasonal due to the outsize index weight of food prices, economists also highlighted weakening sequential

INDIGO SHARES SURGE ON AIRLINE'S TRADING DEBUT

MUMBAI: Shares in India's largest carrier IndiGo soared almost 18 percent above their listing price on the airline's trading debut yesterday, as investors bet on the country's growing appetite for air travel.

In early morning trade, shares of InterGlobe Aviation, IndiGo's parent company, touched 898.00 rupees (\$13.54) — up 17.38 percent from their 765 rupee listing price on the Bombay Stock Exchange. The stock later tapered to close at 878.45 rupees, a rise of 14.83 percent on the starting price.

IndiGo's initial public offering last month was India's biggest in three years and raised

almost \$460 million for the budget carrier. Shares were sold at between 700 rupees and 765 rupees each, with the money raised to be used for trimming the airline's debt and paying for 250 Airbus planes it ordered earlier this year. IndiGo also plans to use the IPO warchest to fund an expansion in services as increasingly wealthy Indians shun the country's creaking rail network in favour of cheap air travel.

In October, India's government unveiled a plan to make air travel affordable for millions of its citizens, with schemes to revive ailing airports and connect rural areas that it said would "take flying to the masses". — AFP





EUROPEAN STOCKS EXTEND LOSSES, ASIA DOWN

LONDON: European stock markets fell for a second day running yesterday as more weak Chinese data added to concerns about a looming US rate hike. China's consumer price index reading-the weakest since May-comes days after Beijing data showed a sharp fall in imports and exports, adding to worries about the growth slowdown in the world's second largest economy.

Officials said prices rose 1.3 percent last month, down from 1.6 percent year-on-year in September.

"A key feature of global economic developments since the 2007 crisis has been the absence of inflation in the major economies," VTB Capital economist Neil MacKinnon said yesterday.

"This reflects a number of factors, but can mostly be attributed to weak global demand and excess supply." In late morning deals, London's benchmark FTSE 100 index fell 0.3 percent, Frankfurt's DAX 30 lost 0.4 percent and the CAC 40 in Paris shed 0.3 percent compared with Monday's close. Traders are meanwhile betting on the US central bank tightening monetary policy in December despite broad weakness across the global economy. "If the Fed is going for a rate hike in December many investors will now be cautious about buying into equities," ADS Securities market strategist Nour Al-Hammoury.

"Yesterday, European and US markets reacted to the increase chance of the hike, all falling by around 1.0 percent." Increased prospects of a US

rate hike, following much better-thanexpected US jobs data on Friday, has meanwhile boosted the dollar's attractiveness that saw it reach six-month highs against the euro on Friday. In the euro-zone's second biggest economy France, economy minister said his country's economy is "lackluster" and will probably remain so in 2016.

"There is a worldwide demand problem today and there is only a single engine left running", the US economy, Emmanuel Macron told Europe 1 radio.

"Any good news will not come from abroad," he said. Macron said France needed to accelerate economic reforms and he called for a "much stronger investment policy in Europe" to rekindle growth on the continent. On the corporate front yesterday, shares in Vodafone rose 4.7 percent to 224.60 pence in London after the British mobile phone giant announced a rise in quarterly revenues, boosting the company's fortunes as its rivals prepare for mega tie-ups.

Asia drops

A further slowdown in Chinese inflation compounded worries about the world's number-two economy yesterday, adding to selling pressure in Asian markets and extending a global retreat as talk of a December US interest rate hike increases.

latest in a string of reports pointing to a growth slowdown in the country.

Officials said prices rose 1.3 percent last month, down from 1.6 percent year-on-year in September. Also, the producer price index, a measure of factory gate prices, fell 5.9 percent-matching the previous two months and marking a six-year low.

The news will add to pressure on Beijing as it struggles to transform the nation's growth model to a more stable one driven by domestic consumption and away from decades of export reliance and state investment. Liu Li-Gang, the chief Greater China economist at Australia & New Zealand Banking Group in Hong Kong, said the latest data "requires the (People's Bank of China) to engage in more aggressive policy easing".

It also brought an end to a five-day rally in Shanghai, which had been boosted Monday by news that authorities will resume initial public offerings this month after a four-month hiatus caused by the summer stock rout.

The market ended 0.2 percent downalthough it pared early hefty losses and Hong Kong dropped 1.4 percent, while Sydney, where several firms that rely on Chinese trade are listed, closed 0.4 percent lower. However, there was some respite for emerging market currencies, which edged up slightly after being hammered Monday by

IN AFRICA, LOCAL COMPANIES OUTPLAY MULTINATIONALS

JOHANNESBURG: Local African companies have gained a competitive edge on the continent over their multinational counterparts and are making inroads where overseas players once dominated, said a report released yesterday. The study by the US-based Boston Consulting Group said African firms had a better understanding of local markets, and had seized opportunities to increase their market share. "In emerging markets, there is no substitute for on-the-ground experience," said a report titled "Dueling with Lions".

"To win new ground, multinationals need to understand how Africa's business

has shifted." The report cited improved economic and political conditions and the adaptability of African businesses, with companies allocating resources to grow domestic operations and develop market-specific products. "African Lions"-such as South Africa's mobile telecommunications firm MTN-were seen to have captured some

valuable emerging African sectors. The report said MTN made a bold move to Nigeria, Africa's biggest economy, "when western carriers were holding

The company has tens of millions of subscribers in Nigeria, but its recent experience in the country has also highlighted the challenges of doing business

It has been hit with a \$5.2 billion fine imposed by the government over unregistered SIM cards it had failed to deactivate. Nigeria's Dangote Cement, owned by Africa's richest man, has also upped its market share, and has ambitious plans to expand across the continent including in Zambia and Zimbabwe

Local positioning

"In Africa, some markets have had very strong growth this decade. Local actors have seized opportunities which the big multinational companies didn't even notice," said Patrick Dupoux, one of the report authors. "One of their key factors of success is their local positioning, their knowledge of the field, of distribution networks, consumers and the supply network" he told AFP

"The multinationals have to adopt a real African strategy and can't afford to

consider the African continent as a marginal place."

Between 2009 and 2013, multinational companies saw an increase in sales, but their market share dropped. In Kenya's cement industry, multinational firms increased revenue from \$287 million in 2009, to \$397 million in 2013, however, their market share declined from 55 percent to 40 percent.

Bottled water industries run by international companies in Egypt and

Morocco also saw a dip in market share. African companies have benefitted from a more educated workforce as "highly skilled Africans have been returning to their homelands", the report said. "Students in countries such as Nigeria, Kenya and Morocco still emigrate, but nowadays they're more likely to come back after they've gotten their education." According to the report, African economies in 2014 and 2015 recorded growth above the world average, despite falling oil and commodity prices, the outbreak of Ebola and some regions hit by militant unrest.

"Even now, as low oil prices threaten the continent's energy exports, Africa's long-term positives are too big to overlook," it said. Two weeks ago, the International Monetary Fund forecast growth in sub-Saharan Africa to dampen from 5.0 percent in 2014 to 3.75 percent this year. Countries such as Ivory Coast, Ethiopia and Mozambique are still expected to post growth rates of at least 7.0 percent this year and next. — AFP

END OF AN ERA: SONY TO STOP MAKING BETAMAX TAPES

TOKYO: Sony announced yesterday the company will stop making Betamax video tapes, ending the storied four-decade history of the product that had been ousted years ago by the more popular VHS format.

"Sony will stop the shipment of Betamax video cassettes and micro MV cassettes in March 2016," the company said in a Japanese-language statement.

"With this step, all of our firm's shipment will end

for recording media using the Betamax format and However, the format, initially supported by Toshiba the micro MV cassette format," which is also a Sonyproduced video standard, it said.

Sony first launched its Betamax products in 1975 as a household, magnetic video format for consumers to record analogue television shows. The popularity of Betamax tapes peaked in 1984 when some 50 million cassettes were shipped, according to Sony. and other electronics makers, is most remembered as the loser of the tense corporate battle in the 1970s and 1980s over setting the de facto household video standard, which was won heartily by the VHS format that was developed by another Japanese electronics maker that now is a part of JVC Kenwood. VHS gave way to digital formats, such as DVDs, that have largely

been replaced by online streaming technology. Sony stopped making Betamax recorders in 2002, but it kept making tapes for die-hard fans. Sony said it has sold more than 18 million units of Betamax devices worldwide since its launch. Sony added it could stop shipping Betamax tapes earlier than the

FOR A HAPPIER LIFE, GIVE UP FACEBOOK

COPENHAGEN: Always envious? Got a nonexistent social life and struggle to concentrate? All this might be down to Facebook if you believe a study showing those who go a week without using the social network feel happier than others.

Carried out by the Happiness Research Institute, the study involved a sample of 1,095 people in Denmark who were divided into two groups, half of whom continued using Facebook while the others stopped. "We focused on Facebook because it is the social media that most people use across age groups," Meik Wiking, HRI's chief executive told AFP yesterday in Copenhagen, the Danish

After a week, those people who hadn't been on Facebook said they were more satisfied with their lives, with 88 percent of them describing themselves as "happy" compared with 81 percent from the second group. Some 84 percent said they appreciated their lives compared with 75 percent in the other group, and only 12 percent described themselves as dissatisfied, compared with 20 percent among those who continued using Facebook. At the end of the experiment, the abstainers reported having a richer social life and fewer difficulties in concentrating, while the others reported no such change.

"Instead of focusing on what we actually need, we have an unfortunate tendency to focus on what other people have," the authors of the study wrote. In other words, Facebook users are 39 percent more likely to feel less happy than non-users. — AFP

SNAPCHAT VANISHING VIDEO VIEWING HITS 6 BILLION DAILY

SAN FRANCISCO: Snapchat on Monday confirmed that six billion vanishing videos are viewed daily at the service in a three-fold surge from early this year. The highly-valued startup declined to comment on what it thought was powering the rapid growth.

"It is a huge number for them," analyst Rob Enderle of Ederle Group said of the Snapchat video viewing number. "But, you have to be concerned about the nature of the videos; and if they are illicit in nature, a huge number could go away." The analyst considered it challenging to make money from videos that vanish after being sent from one person to another, instead of lingering for arrays of people to watch the way they do at online venues such as YouTube or

Facebook revealed during a quarterly earnings call last week that more than eight billion videos are viewed daily at the leading social network, jumping to a level twice as high as it was early this year. Videos are considered viewed at Snapchat after being displayed for fractions of seconds, while its takes several seconds to achieve that status at Facebook and approximately half-a-minute at YouTube.

Stories and replays

Snapchat's appeal has been the promise that messages shared disappear shortly after being viewed, providing users a sense of being able to keep pictures or videos private and ephemeral.

Snapchat last month introduced a "replay" feature for those disappearing messages, giving users an option to get another look at three "snaps" for a fee of 99 cents. The feature was the first by the Los Angeles-based social network to get revenue from its user base in addition to advertising messages.

Snapchat in May said it raised \$537 million in a new round of equity funding. The vanishingmessage service did not disclose who bought stakes in the Los Angeles-based company, which came at a price estimated to give Snapchat a value of more than \$15 billion, according to media offer from Facebook in 2013. Snapchat rocketed to popularity in the United States, especially among teenagers, after the initial app was released in September 2011.

Smartphone app Snapchat late last year began letting users in the United States send money to friends by simply typing dollar amounts into new "Snapcash" messages. The new feature came from a collaboration

between Snapchat and Square, a mobile payments company headed by Twitter co-founder Jack Dorsev.

Smartphone app Snapchat has since added features such as letting users in the United States send money to friends by simply typing dollar amounts into new "Snapcash" messages.

The feature came from a first collaboration between Snapchat and Square, a mobile payments company headed by Twitter co-founder Jack Dorsey. Snapchat also added a "Stories" feature that strings together a series of "snaps" to create a narrative that is available for repeated viewing by recipients for 24 hours. — AFP

REAL-WORLD 'INDIANA JONES' INS COVETED TED PRIZE

ARCHEOLOGIST VOWS TO USE TED PRIZE TO PROTECT TREASURES

SAN FRANCISCO: A technologywielding archaeologist billed as a modern world "Indiana Jones" won a coveted million-dollar TED prize Monday for her work tracking antiqui-

ties and the looting of such wonders. Sarah Parcak was named winner of a 2016 TED Prize that provides a million dollars to kickstart a big-vision "wish" and opens a door to call on the nonprofit organization's innovative, influential and ingenious community

of "tedsters." Parcak is to reveal her wish at an annual TED Conference in Vancouver in February. "I am honored to receive the TED Prize, but it's not about me; it's about our field-and the thousands of men and women around the world, particularly in the Middle East, who are defending and protecting sites,"

"The last four and half years have been horrific for archeology." Parcak bemoaned extensive looting and destruction at archaeological sights that she has mapped using a method she created for processing satellite

The archeologist vowed to use the TED Prize to rally the world to find and protect such treasures. "At a moment when so many ancient sites are under threat-and being destroyed-it feels particularly poignant that we are awarding the TED Prize to a brilliant mind, committed to finding, sharing and protecting these gems," said TED Prize director

Hidden tombs

Parcak was introduced to aerial photography through her grandfather's use of it in forestry work. She was studying Egyptology at Yale when she began exploring the potential for using more modern tools to apply her grandfather's approach to archeology, according to TED.

Parcak was pursuing an advanced degree at Cambridge University when she created a technique for processing infrared imagery from satellites that helped her detect undiscovered archaeological sites in Egypt. She has since turned to mapping looting. Her work has caused some to refer to Parcak as a modern-age, real-world version of the Indian Jones character made famous in films starring Harrison Ford.

"TED is committed to the ancient tradition of storytelling, and making it relevant to a modern, global audience," Verghese said.

"Sarah's work honors that-she uses 21st century technology to make the world's ancient, invisible history visible once again."

Parcak is a professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, where she founded the Laboratory for Global Observation. She has won attention for her work satellite mapping Egypt and uncovering hidden pyramids, tombs and settlements. Parcak and her team have been credited with also discovering ancient sites in Europe, the Mediterranean and North America as well as extensively mapping looting in Egypt.

The annual TED Prize has grown from \$100,000 to a million dollars since it was first awarded in the year 2005, to U2 band leader Bono and his vision of fighting poverty and disease.

The list of previous winners includes oceans-defender Sylvia Earle and StoryCorps founder Dave Isay, whose wish was to use smartphone applications to archive the spoken wisdom of humanity.

The TED community includes scientists, celebrities, politicians, artists, and entrepreneurs. Since being born in California in 1984, the gathering has grown into a global forum for "ideas worth spreading."

TED has won a worldwide following for trademark "talks" during which accomplished speakers deliver thought-sparking presentations. Videos of talks are available for free online at ted.com. — AFP

LETV TO RELEASE PHONE, SMART TVS, 4K STREAMING BOX IN US

LOS ANGELES: Chinese online video and consumer electronics heavyweight LeTV is getting ready to enter the US market with a number of products, including an Android-based smartphone, a bike with an integrated GPS device as well as smart TVs, a 4K video streaming box and a VR headset. The company could introduce, and possibly even start to sell, its products to US customers as early as this week.

LeTV is little known in the US, but has emerged as a significant player in the Chinese online video market. Last year, LeTV generated an estimated \$1.6 billion in revenue with online content as well as sales of smart TVs in China. Earlier this year, it launched its first smartphones in the country. LeTV Holdings vice chairman Zhang Zhao said at Variety's recent Big Data Summit that the company plans to bring its phones and TVs to the US as well. "We consider ourselves a global company," he said.

Recent teasers posted on LeTV's own website and social media accounts suggest that the company may be looking to sell a number of additional products to U.S. consumers: LeTV published videos to its YouTube account last month that briefly show off the Le1 Pro smartphone, a VR headset, a smart bicycle dubbed the Buzzard Super Bike and its Super TV.

A number of these products have also been approved by the FCC in recent weeks, giving us further clues as to what LeTV is up to. Earlier in October, a VR headset based on LeTV's smartphone passed the FCC. And at the end of

October, LeTV gained FCC approval for two smart TV sets, with one featuring a 55-inch LED screen, and the other coming in at 65 inches. Both TV sets will deliver a 4K resolution, and ship with two sets of 3D glasses. Both will also come with a smart TV remote that features an integrated microphone for voice

In addition to its smart TVs, LeTV also got the FCC approval for a Roku-like streaming media player. The LeTV Box U3 is also capable of streaming video in 4K, and also comes with a remote control with voice search. However, the user manual included in the FCC filing mentions that "currently, only Mandarin is sup-

ported in voice control. That may seem like a major limitation, especially if LeTV is trying to compete with devices like Apple TV, Roku and Fire TV. However, focusing on Chinese expats first actually seems to be part of the company's strategy. LeTV has long emphasized content as a driver for device sales, and LeTV VP and GM JD Howard told Variety earlier this year that the company may at first concentrate on Chinese-language content when it enters the

There are more than three million people who speak Chinese at home in the US, according to census data, and many are looking to watch content in their native language. In addition to licensing and producing Chinese content, LeTV has also been investing in the production of US movies and titles that appeal

to both audiences. Just this week, the company's content subsidiary Le Vision signed a twopicture deal with the "Lion King" director Rob Minkoff. LeTV isn't the only Chinese consumer electronics giant looking to enter the US market with its products. The company is closely competing with Xiaomi, which has become the No. 1 smartphone seller in China within just a few years through a direct sales model that lets consumers order devices online, cutting out retailers and carriers to keep device prices low. LeTV is using the same model in China, and is apparently looking to take the same approach as it enters the US. The company's nascent US ecommerce website Lemall.com has been teasing a big unveil for this coming Wednesday. — Reuters



IRVINE, California: When Chase Bailey was diagnosed with autism at 2, his mother feared he'd never enjoy a typical childhood. Indeed, he hasn't. Between appearances with celebrities and hosting his own cooking show, Bailey's life feels anything but typical. During the past two years, the 13-year-Korean-American street food guru Roy get him to eat. Like many on the

After her son's diagnosis, friends and acquaintances prepared Mary Bailey for the worst. He'd never be able to have a job, some said. He'd probably never learn to socialize. And he'd never be independent. "You just hear a lot of things that are downers," she said. She immediately placed her son in school old has spiced up ramen noodles with and therapy. At home, she struggled to

The days when Bailey would eat nothing but pizza, chicken, french fries, chocolate chip cookies, and chips with dip almost seem like a faint memory. "He wasn't even eating food until he was 8 years old," said Nick Shipp, executive chef at The Upper West, the Santa Monica, California, restaurant where Bailey helps cook dinner once a week. "For him to go from that to cooking and eating all kinds of different things, it's pretty remarkable."

autism spectrum, Chase found food overwhelming. The sight, smell, feel and taste of almost everything put on his plate tipped his sensory system over the edge. "I didn't like how it looked," he said. "I didn't like how it smelled."

Then he started watching cooking shows with his grandfather. He got hooked on seeing people enjoy the food they were eating. Within six months, he started asking to try some of the foods he saw on shows like Cooking Channel's "Eat St." and Food Network's "Chopped." Among his early requests: fried alligator, frog legs and beef tongue. "He was just devouring it," Mary Bailey recalled with a laugh. Two years later, he confided to his mother that one day he wanted to have his own cooking show. "She was like, 'Why wait?" Chase Bailey said.

Setting out with her home cam-

corder and using a friend's kitchen, they recorded the first episode of "Chase 'N Yur Face" and posted it to YouTube. The show quickly caught the attention of autism groups and, realizing the impact they could have, Mary Bailey began looking for ways to enhance the production. She hired a professional film crew and started incorporating cooking and shooting episodes into her son's homeschool curriculum.

Tape episodes

Chase Bailey, using the cooking shows he watched as inspiration, started reaching out by email to chefs he admired and invited them to tape episodes with him. "It was no big deal," Bailey said nonchalantly. "I'm like, 'If they're doing it, I'm doing it." In the show, a confident, charismatic Chase whips up everything from cupcakes to braised rabbit. The show - which now has more than 30 episodes online - has garnered tens of thousands of views. "I love that there's a story behind it," said Sumner, an actress living in Los Angeles. She recently taped a holiday special with the teen. "Food is emotion-

The most challenging part, Mary Bailey said, has been learning how to produce a show. She spent 20 years in the corporate world before leaving a management position to focus fulltime on her son. Chase Bailey said his biggest challenge was learning how to fry chicken while talking in front of a camera.

"To see your child go from little to no speech, no eye contact ... having extreme food aversions, all of these symptoms, to almost the exact opposite," Mary Bailey said, "I don't know, it feels miraculous." Chase Bailey dreams of one day seeing his show on television and wants to open his own restaurant. He also hopes his experience can help others with autism. "Don't be afraid to be you," Chase Bailey said. "Hear, hear," Sumner said. "Be yourself because everyone else is taken." — AP

CLIMATE CHANGE TIED TO LOWER BIRTH RATE IN US

NEW YORK: Climate change has likely been contributing to a steady decline in the US birth rate, researchers said, predicting as many as 100,000 fewer babies born each year by the end of the century. Data shows the number of babies born drops in the eight to 10 months after a spate of days on which the average temperature exceeds 80° F (26.6° C), according to research by the National Bureau of Economic Research, a non-partisan group based in Cambridge, Massachusetts.

The reason remains unclear, researchers said. People may have fewer sexual relations during warmer weather, or more likely such weather affects reproductive health, they said. For men, exposure to extreme heat can negatively affect semen quality and testosterone, and in women it could have an impact on menstruation, ovulation and implantation of fertilized eggs. The data showed that on average between 1931 through 2010, each hot day resulted in 1,165 fewer baby births across the United States some nine months later. The trend could result in some 100,000 fewer babies born per year in the United States by the end of this century, according

"We still don't know exactly how these temperature shocks are going to impact developing countries," said Alan Barreca, a co-author and professor of economics at Tulane University in New Orleans, Louisiana. The US birthrate has largely been on the decline over several decades, although the number of births increased slightly in 2014, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Air conditioning could mitigate some of the impact of climate change on fertility, the study said. However, hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs), the potent greenhouse gases used in air conditioning, would contribute to global warming, Barreca said. World leaders meet in Paris later this month to work on a plan to reduce the effects of climate change. — Reuters

MELTING ARCTIC ICE CAP COULD ALTER GLOBAL THERMOSTAT

ABOARD CCGS AMUNDSEN, Canada: The Arctic ice cap is melting faster than ever before, threatening to push so much fresh water into the North Atlantic that it could disrupt how the ocean regulates global temperatures, a prominent oceanographer has warned. As the head of a 40-member climate mission to the Arctic aboard the Canadian Coast Guard ice breaker Amundsen, Belgian researcher Roger Francois is concerned about how the pace of climate change may affect the future of deep water pools and currents, and how this imbalance may worsen the effects of global warming.

Over the course of the past two million years, temperatures have risen and fallen in 100,000year cycles, with a sheet of ice forming over the Arctic cap each time followed by a rapid melt, he told AFP. The last warming occurred between 20,000 and 15,000 years ago, and led at that time to a rise in sea level of 130 meters (425 feet). "This really is the trend with the thaws in Greenland and Antarctica," said Francois, who is a professor at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver.

"The biggest difference with today is the time scale. It has never been faster." Each cycle is marked by an increase in carbon in the atmosphere. At the last change, the rate of carbon dioxide in the air increased from 180 parts per million to 280 ppm over 5,000 years. Until the Industrial Revolution, the level remained at 280 ppm, and since then it has skyrocketed to more than 400 ppm in 2015, he explained. "If we continue this way, and that's what seems to be happening, we'll end up by the end of the century with rates we have not had since the days of the dinosaurs, the Mesozoic Age," with 1,000 ppm, Francois

'Feedbacks'

The last deglaciation, or disappearance of ice from an area that was formerly covered by it, was followed by a much longer than usual period of climate stability, which allowed Homo sapiens to flourish. "Our civilization, as we know it, is actually a direct result of climate change," said Francois. At the heart of this climate are "deep water" masses that are created in the North Atlantic off Greenland when surface seawater evaporates and cools as wind blows over it, resulting in increased salinity. The remaining water becomes heavier and more dense and sinks into deep basins. The water then flows southward along deep abyssal plains and back, creating currents that are "a major mechanism for transporting heat from the equator to the poles," said Francois. With the melting of the ice cap, dilution in the sea of icebergs made of fresh water "lowers salinity, and makes more difficult the formation of deep water masses," he explained. But if the heat transfer between the equator and the poles is interrupted because this deep water circulation is broken, then "high latitudes become much colder," he said. Such a scenario already happened during

the last global warming. "It was still colder in early deglaciation than during the Ice Age in northern Europe in particular," said the oceans researcher. Changing of the deep water formation is only one of several climate phenomena that can amplify the effects of global warming. These so-called "feedbacks" can cause climate change to spiral out of control. An oft-cited example of this is the melting of sea ice due to warming exposing darker seas that absorb heat instead of reflecting sunshine, which hastens warming. — AFP

World energy use to grow one-third in 25 years


PARIS: Global energy use is set to grow by onethird over the next 25 years, driven mostly by emerging economies, the International Energy Agency said yesterday. Energy consumption in the most developed nations is expected to decline over the same period, it said in its annual World Energy Outlook. The main drivers for increased overall energy consumption will be India, China, Africa, the Middle East and Southeast Asia, the report said. But energy use is projected to drop by 15 percent by 2040 in the European Union, 12 percent in Japan and 3 percent in the US on the back of increased energy efficiency, energy savings and demographic trends. The use of low-carbon fuels and technologies is on the rise, and the share of non-fossil fuels in the total mix is set to increase to 25 percent by 2040 from 19 now, the Pari-based

IEA said. This trend confirmed what the IEA called a "tantalizing hint" that economic growth will longer systematically translate into higher

CO2 emissions "Pledges made in advance of COP21 promise to give new impetus to the move towards a lower-carbon and more efficient energy system, but do not alter the picture of rising global needs for energy," the IEA noted. COP21 refers to a key UN climate change summit taking place in Paris from the end of this month, tasked with producing a climate rescue pact. Among fossil fuels, natural gas, the least carbon-intensive, is the only one expected to see its share rise, the IEA report added. "Where it replaces more carbonintensive fuels or backs up the integration of renewables, natural gas is a good fit for a gradually decarbonising energy system," the IEA said.

As demand for oil picks up, the oil price is expected to recover gradually to reach \$80 per barrel in 2020, the IEA said. In the following two decades oil demand is likely to level off as governments continue to reduce subsidies and there is further momentum towards energy efficiency and alternative energy sources. With less than three weeks to go before the crucial COP21 conference, the IEA said an ongoing policy shift was not enough to avoid the worst effects of climate change. "There are unmistakeable signs that the much-needed global energy transition is underway, but not yet at a pace that leads to a lasting reversal of the trend of rising CO2 emissions," it said. The world still needed a "clear and credible vision of longterm decarbonisation" to combat climate change. — AFP

ONE YEAR AFTER COMET TOUCHDOWN, WHAT'S NEXT FOR PHILAE?

PARIS: A year ago on Thursday, the world held its collective breath as a European spacecraft dropped a tiny robot lab onto the surface of a comet hurtling towards the Sun. The 12 months since that bumpy landing have yielded many exciting scientific finds, and more than a little drama, as Philae intermittently phoned home from its alien host between long bouts of sleep. Now, after four months without word, perched on comet 67P/Churyumov-Gerasimenko, ground controllers are hoping for a last chance to make contact and even do some science before the lander finally runs out of steam. "We hope to resume a series of scientific operations with Philae in the coming weeks," lander scientist Jean-Pierre Bibring told AFP.

Assuming the lab's instruments are working and its solar panels tilted at the right angle, "we could have several contacts with the robot beginning this week" and instruct it to run experiments, possibly even the drill it has not

yet successfully deployed. Conditions will be best in the period from the end of November to the beginning of December, scientists say. Philae touched down on 67P on November 12 last year after a 10-year, 6.5-billion-kilometre (four-billion-mile) journey through space, piggybacking on European mothership Rosetta, now orbiting the comet.

The landing was bumpy-the washing machine-sized lab bounced several times on the craggy surface before ending up at an angle in deep shade, deprived of battery-replenishing sunlight. Philae sent home data from about 60 hours of comet sniffing and prodding with eight of its 10 instruments, before going into standby mode on November 15, 2014.

Status unknown

The lander's power pack was recharged as 67P drew closer to the Sun on its elliptical orbit, and Philae woke up on June 13, to great excitement on Earth. It made eight intermittent contacts, uploading data, only to fall silent again on July 9. The robot lab's current status is unknown. Part of the problem is that Rosetta had to move into a more distant orbit, out of radio reach, as its sensitive star-navigation system became confused in the outpouring of dust from 67P as it shaved past the Sun.

So Philae may be awake and trying to establish contact, without anyone knowing. The comet passed its closest point to the Sun, or perihelion, in August this year, and Rosetta has now started descending as the dust has diminished. By Monday, it was at about 200 km-down from some 300 km at its widest orbit, and 10 km at its narrowest. In theory, Philae should have enough solar power at its current distance from the Sun-some 270 million kilometers-and a healthy core temperature. But the window for contact is short, said Mark McCaughrean, senior science advisor at the European Space Agency. — AFP

PUTIN'S ELDER DAUGHTER: A SPECIALIST IN BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

LONDON/MOSCOW: Vladimir Putin's elder daughter, Maria, has kept out of the spotlight even more than her sister. Reuters was unable to find any recent, confirmed photographs of Maria. Born on Apr 28, 1985, Maria studied biology at St Petersburg University and medicine at Moscow State University. According to Russian and Western media reports, she married a Dutch businessman called Jorrit Joost Faassen. Some reports claimed she lived in the Netherlands for a while, but this could not be confirmed.

Earlier this year, Putin said both his daughters were living in Moscow, but gave no further details. Maria now uses the surname Faassen, and under that name she is pursuing a biomedical career specializing in the endocrine system, which controls the body's hormones, according to academic listings and publications. On the website of Istina, a directory of scholars and their work at Moscow State University, she is listed as co-author of five studies published in the past two years, with titles including "The status of blood antioxidant system in patients with active acromegaly."

She is also the co-author of a book about "Idiopathic stunting" in children, published earlier this year by Lambert Academic Publishing.

Maria is a PhD candidate at the Endocrinology Research Centre in Moscow, which runs a charity project, Alfa-Endo, that helps children affected by endocrine ailments. The project's website includes a presentation by Maria. Maria told Reuters in an email that requests for information about the centre should be directed to its leadership. She did not respond to questions about when she was married or whether her father's position had affected her career.

Alfa-Endo is funded by Alfa Bank, a large Russian bank with subsidiaries in the United States, Britain and Cyprus. The largest shareholder is Mikhail Fridman, a billionaire with interests in banking, energy and telecoms. An official at the bank said: "Alfa Bank, and broadly speaking Alfa Group, act as financial sponsors for the project and that's it ... We are not aware who else is participating in the project otherwise." Maria's husband used to work for Gazprombank, a large lender with strong links to the elite around Putin. And until at least August this year, Jorrit Joost Faassen was listed on the website of MEF Audit, a Russian consulting group, as its deputy chairman. He no longer appears on the website and did not respond to requests for comment. — Reuters

SCIENCE'S 'BREAKTHROUGH' WINNERS EARN OVER \$21 MILLION IN PRIZES MOUNTAIN VIEW, California: Academia just ences for advances in areas ranging from opto-

turned a little more glitzy for a select group of scientists. Russian billionaire Yuri Milner on Sunday handed out seven Breakthrough Prizes, the award for scientific accomplishment he created three years ago alongside technology giants including Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg, 23andme founder Anne Wojcicki and Google co-founder Sergey Brin. The prizes are worth \$3 million, around three times the sum a Nobel Prize winner receives.

For one group of Breakthrough recipients, the honor will carry more prestige than cash. Some 1370 physicists are being honored as part of a single \$3 million prize for their work confirming the theory of neutrino oscillation, a phenomenon in quantum mechanics. Seven team leaders will split two-thirds of the prize. That leaves \$1 million to split among the others, or around \$700 to each physicist. "I would love to give \$3 million to each one, but we're not there yet," Milner said in an interview on Friday. Increasingly, he added, breakthroughs are made through vast consortiums rather than a handful of scientists working in relative isolation, raising the chances of such shared prizes in future.

Five prizes went to researchers in life sci-

ences for advances in areas ranging from optogenetics to sequencing of ancient genomes. A prize in mathematics went to a professor at the University of California, Berkeley, for work in low dimensional topology and geometric group theory.

Eight scientists early in their mathematics and physics careers won awards of \$100,000. Milner has set his sights on giving the sciences the same cultural resonance as sports or entertainment, but on Friday, he said it was too early to see if his work was having any effect. He pointed to the ceremony's broadcast on a major US network, Fox, for the first time as a sign things were moving in the right direction. A onetime physics PhD student in Moscow who dropped out to move to the United States in 1990, Milner has backed some of the world's biggest technology companies, including Facebook. Seth MacFarlane, creator of the hit TV series "Family Guy," is hosted the black-tie ceremony, held at the NASA Ames Research Center in Mountain View, Calif. Atkinson finalizes his 'quickie' divorce from his wife Sunetra

owan Atkinson has been given a "quickie" divorce from his wife of 24 years Sunetra. The 'Mr Bean' actor - who separated from the BBC make-up artist in 2014 - was granted a decree nisi by District Judge Stephen Alderson at London's Central Family Court today at a hearing neither he nor Sunetra attended. The couple's divorce was given on the grounds of "unreasonable behavior" and was reportedly finalized in less than a minute. Rowan, 60, and 54-year-old Sunetra met in the 1980s when she was working as a BBC make-up artist and he was one of the corporation's main comedy stars and they went on to tie the knot in 1990. Swift settles Lucky 13 legal battle

aylor Swift has reportedly settled her Lucky 13 legal dispute with the Blue Sphere. The 25-year-old singer will no longer face deposition after she called for the case to be put to bed following allegations that she copied the US-based clothing company's trademarks, according to The Hollywood Reporter. Robert Kloetzly filed a lawsuit against the 'Trouble' hitmaker in May 2014 claiming she had used the company's Lucky 13 shamrock design for her T-shirts and greeting cards. He was seeking damages and all of her profits as he believed the blonde star had "confused" buyers and put his business, which he launched

in 1991, in jeopardy. However, Taylor and her legal team hit back, arguing that her merchandise was totally different and the company, which she believes is little known across the US, hadn't suffered any losses nor damage to its name. The legal dispute stepped up a level earlier this year when the company tried to reach out to the companies the starlet had worked with in the past on a promotional basis. Taylor's team then went back to the courts and alleged Blue Sphere was "harassing" her, but the claim was thrown out.

Busted reforming for a 2016 tour and a new album



Elton John, Bon Jovi to headline 24-hour climate concert

■ Iton John and Bon Jovi will headline a 24-hour performance this month aimed at urging environmental action ahead of key climate change talks in Paris, organizers said Monday. The event, spearheaded by former US vice president Al Gore and known as "24 Hours of Reality and Live Earth," will feature artists, scientists and politicians and will air

online November 13 and 14. "Each hour, the broadcast will be punctuated by thought-provoking, knockout appearances from an all-star lineup," organizers said in a statement.

"The broadcast is aimed at urging world leaders to push for the strongest possible climate agreement at the upcoming UN conference in Paris, and at urging people to take action in their own communities and homes." Back in May, Live Earth-a set of global concerts backed by Gore-announced a delay to planned shows on each inhabited continent. Live Earth was initially intended to consist of concerts on June 18 in Australia, Brazil, China, South Africa and the United States, as well as Paris. The November 13-14 broadcast is a partnership between the Climate Reality Project and Live Earth, designed to "include an unprecedented artistic lineup and distribution platform to maximize its global reach," organizers said.

Among those scheduled to appear are French President François Hollande, Mexican President Felipe Calderon, Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo, California Governor Jerry Brown, actors Ryan Reynolds, Jared Leto and Ed Begley Jr, and former UN Secretary General Kofi Annan. The first Climate Reality broadcast aired in 2011. Gore won the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts on climate change. A slideshow presented by Gore about the dangers of climate change was the basis of the popular 2006 documentary "An Inconvenient Truth," which won two Academy Awards. — AFP

New Orleans R&B legend Allen Toussaint dead at 77

&B legend Allen Toussaint, one of the signature forces in New Orleans music whose songs have been played by a who's who of rock greats, has died,

A lifelong New Orleans resident, the songwriter and local television said yesterday. The Rock and Roll Hall of Famer, who was 77, died hours after a performance Monday in Madrid, his family told New Orleans station WWL. Raised in a humble home, Toussaint from a young age mingled with many of New Orleans' leading musicians and helped make the city-best known as the birthplace of jazz-a global center for R&B production of popular songs.

Artists who came to Toussaint included Paul McCartney, Eric Clapton, Elvis Costello, Joe Cocker and The Rolling Stones, whose early hit "Pain in My Heart" was penned by the New Orleans great. "He brought the New Orleans sound to the national stage, and it remains a vital and ongoing part of our musical heritage to this day,"


pianist reluctantly fled in 2005 when Hurricane Katrina devastated the city, temporarily relocating to New York. But he returned and has since been active in reconstruction and other humanitarian projects. After his European tour, he had been scheduled to perform in New Orleans on December 8 at a charity benefit with Paul Simon against homelessness and hunger.

US President Barack Obama recognized his contributions both to music and development when he presented him with the National Medal of the Arts in 2013. "After his hometown was battered by Katrina and Allen was forced to evacuate, he did something even more important for his city-he went back. And since then, Allen has devoted

his musical talent to lifting up and building up a city," Obama said. In an interview at the time with The Wall Street Journal, Toussaint said he could not quite believe what he had achieved over the years.

"On my 14th birthday... for whatever reason, I said to myself, 'I'm 14 and every 10 years I'm going to check back with this 14-year-old and tell him how I'm doing," he said.

"I have no idea how I came up with that, but from then on I had those chats. They don't last long," he said. "I often say how surprised I am at how far I've come. The 14-yearold at the piano just listens-but he always seems as surprised as I am."—AFP

Cannes film fest laureate Jacques Audiard tackles western

fter winning top honors at the deWitt, and recounts the story of two Cannes Film Festival for his refugee movie, French filmmaker Jacques Audiard is now working on a western set during the California Gold Rush. "What I like about westerns and which you find in 'The Sisters Brothers,' is the birth of democracy, the end of savagery, where you leave your guns at the village entrance," Audiard told AFP. The director spoke in Los Angeles, where he was presenting "Dheepan," which captured the Palme d'Or prize at Cannes.

Audiard's new project is an adaptation of a book by Canadian author Patrick

brothers-Eli and Charlie Sisters-hired to kill a prospector who has stolen from their boss. The story takes place in Oregon and California during the Gold Rush in 1851. "That period was incredibly savage," said the 63-year-old director, who hopes to begin filming what will be his first Englishlanguage project next summer.

"Nothing was off-limits then," he added. "One killed his father, mother, children, in the quest for money and I think this can resonate (with what we see happening in today's society)." The film will star US actor John C Reilly, whose production company bought the rights to the novel. "If I am able to push ahead, I will have a script by the end of December and shoot this summer," said Audiard, whose film credits include "The Beat That My Heart Skipped," "Rust and Bone" and "A Prophet." "Dheepan" is about a former Sri Lankan soldier's struggles in a French housing project after fleeing the separatist war.

Audiard, whose father Michel Audiard is also an acclaimed screenwriter and film director, said the prize had not particularly opened doors for him. "I always say that I am privileged and the Palme doesn't change much except that you suddenly find yourself part of a club that you always watched from afar," he said. And besides, Audiard added as he drew on a cigarette, the Cannes prize doesn't seem to impress much in Hollywood. "Over here what counts are the Golden Globes and the Oscars," he said. — AFP

Sarandon boards **Lamarr** documentary

usan Sarandon and Reframed Pictures are partnering with American Masters and Submarine on a documentary about Hedy Lamarr. "This is the story of a Hollywood actress, defined by her appearance, who is secretly a brilliant inventor and changes the course of history," said Sarandon. Alexandra Dean will direct the film with the working title "Hedy: The Untold Story of Actress and Inventor Hedy Lamarr." Katherine Drew and Adam Haggiag will produce, Sarandon and Michael Kantor will exec produce, and

David Koh and Dan Braun of Submarine will co-produce.

The film will be produced in association with Thirteen Productions LLC's American Masters for WNET, and have its exclusive US broadcast premiere on the "American Masters" series on PBS. The documentary received funding from the Alfred P Sloan Foundation. Lamarr, who would have turned 101 on Monday, is celebrated today with a Google doodle. Lamarr appeared nude at the age of 17 in the 1933 Czech film "Ecstasy" and later married a prominent Austrian businessman who became a weapons dealer to the Nazis. Lamarr, who was born Jewish, fled her husband in the middle of the night, boarding a boat for America with nothing to her name except a single designer gown. She eventually convinced MGM boss Louis B. Mayer to sign her to a deal.

She married six times. Lamarr was also a secret inventor who helped the Allies win the war with a wireless form of communication called "frequency hopping," which would go on to revolutionize communications all over the world. Submarine has pre-sold the German and Austrian rights to NFP Films; pan-Scandinavian rights to NonStop Entertainment; Canadian rights to Films We Like; and UK distribution rights and the rest of the world to Dogwoof. The deal was announced at the American Film Market. Submarine is representing theatrical and the rest of the rights, minus television, for the US.—Reuters

Folk star Alela **Diane** finds new voice in duo

ndie folk singer Alela Diane last released an album amid full personal crisis, putting into verse a painful divorce. Two years later, she is back-not only with a new husband and child, but with a new musical partner. Diane-who was born in the arid Gold Rush town of Nevada City, California, but has found a particularly strong following in Europe-won critical acclaim for her intensely personal 2013 album "About Farewell" on the disintegration of her first

The 32-year-old has since moved on, remarried and had a child, but found herself in a musical rut until she encountered Ryan Francesconi, a fellow artist based in the indie music capital of Portland, Oregon. "My daughter's almost two now, but when we started she was about one and I wasn't ready to make another solo album. I didn't feel like I had that inside of me," she told AFP on a recent trip to Paris. "But I was ready to make some art again. I was missing singing," she said. Francesconi's proposal to work together eased some of the initial pressure, she said. The result was an album, "Cold Moon," that came out last month. "We weren't trying to make a record. It wasn't planned," he said.

An ecological approach

Diane-who has worked in the past with Joanna Newsom, another star born in Nevada City who made an impact in the indie folk scene-first won a following a decade ago with "The Pirate's Gospel," an album of meditative songs with a slight twang on a self-taught guitar. Francesconi's musical interests lie farther away, with a primary focus on Balkan folk music but also a fondness for traditional Greek dances. "Cold Moon" consists of eight songs with a contemplative, autumnal mood, with some tracks stretching to seven minutes.

Asked to describe Francesconi's style, Diane said: "I don't want to say the word sophistication, but I do: it has just a real musicality behind it. It's a lot more complex that anything I'm capable of creating on my own." Francesconi, who is generally known for instrumental music, said that the collaboration with Diane in turn gave him the chance to "actually do songwriting." He described his approach as allowing space inside the music for words. "You have to write enough, but not too much," he said.


Such an ecological way of thinking is fitting for Francesconi, who is married to an environmental activist and travels within cities exclusively by bicycle. The ecological theme is felt throughout "Cold Moon." Without overt political messages, much of the lyricism revolves around nature and criticism of development. On "Shapeless," for example, Diane voices her regrets at not seeing the stars at night due to the urban lights. After an album on divorce, "It was an opportunity to get outside of myself a bit and think about bigger things," she said.

Diane is touring Europe with Francesconi, followed by concerts across North America with Newsom. But she is performing for now without her father, a presence in her music since "The Pirate's Gospel," which was initially homerecorded and self-released. "He always feels like my dad, but in a lot of ways my dad is like a big kid. And I don't like being a boss!" she said. — AFP

orn in Kansas in 1932, Wendell Castle received a B.F.A. from the University of Kansas in Industrial Design in 1958 and an M.F.A. in sculpture, graduating in 1961. He moved to Rochester, New York to teach at the School of American Craftsmen and established a permanent studio in the area, which is where he still works today. Wendell Castle's work can be found in the permanent collections of more than 40 museums and cultural institutions worldwide, including: Art Institute of Chicago, (IL); Los Angeles County Museum of Art, (CA); the Metropolitan Museum of Art (New York, NY); Museum of Modern Art (New York, NY); Minneapolis Institute of Arts, (MN); MusÈe des beaux-arts de MontrÈal (Quebec, Canada); Museum of Arts and Design (New York, NY);

Teen fashionistas on 'Project Runway Junior' make it work

■im Gunn said he was apprehensive about participating in a bite-size version of "Project Runway" featuring teen designers as young as 13. "I thought," he recalled in a recent interview, "will I have to soft-pedal my critiques? Is it all going to be watered down? Are they going to be emotional wrecks and very fragile?" Gunn was pleasantly surprised by the freshman class on "Project Runway Junior," which premieres Thursday at 9 pm EST on Lifetime. And yes, he DOES employ his signature catchphrase: "Make it work!" The mentor, former educator at the Parsons design school and adult wrangler on the long-running "Project Runway" called the new show's young contestants lovable, sweet to each other and respectful of the process swirling around them.

That's saying a lot, considering the age range - 13 to 17 - among the 12 contestants from around the country. Gunn saw bits of his younger self in them all, as did his co-host, model Hannah Davis, and two of the three judges, Christian Siriano and Kelly Osbourne. Aya Kanai, the executive fashion editor at Cosmopolitan and Seventeen magazines, rounds out the judges' crew. "These young people ... are all loners. There's no one like them who comes home from school and plays with a sewing machine," Osbourne said. "They've been put in a room of their peers, with kids just like them, for the first time in their life." Gunn agreed.

Accept responsibility

"For the boys on the show, you know they were the picked upon, bullied, odd people out in their schools, and yeah, I was that kid," he said. The 62-year-old Gunn recalled his own miserable childhood. Growing up in Washington, DC, he had a debilitating stutter that went untreated until he was 19. It was a time in his life when he was "coming to terms with the importance of being a responsible citizen of the world and not fleeing it, which is what I spent almost the first 20 years of my life doing." He saw none of that in the kids on the show.

"Compared to the designers on a regular season of 'Runway,' these teens ... accept responsibility for their actions," Gunn said. "There's never any factor that comes into their interaction with the judges or with me about why this isn't going as well as they had wanted it to go, versus regular 'Runway' when there's nothing but excuses." The entire cast got a high-level treat. The Dec. 10 episode will feature a video appearance by first lady Michelle Obama to announce a challenge supporting education for girls.

Bella Thorne is a guest judge for the final challenge. Siriano, Osbourne and Davis didn't put in the work room time with the kids like Gunn did and were shocked to learn they, like adult 'Runway' contestants, had no help, did the work themselves and produced designs quickly, over a tight span of 10 hours for some challenges.

Mixed results

"It's almost cooler working with kids than adults because they were figuring it all out along the way," Davis said. Siriano added: "We were told to give them real criticism like they would get if they were presenting to an editor or to anyone else in the industry." Food TV and other networks have spun off adult competitions into kid versions with mixed results. "I think kids could just be a big flop," Gunn said. "There has to be some substance." They saw an abundance of that in the youngest contestant, 13-year-old Maya from Maumee, Ohio.

"She's amazing," Siriano said. "Everything she makes on the show is unreal." Cast through open auditions, the contestants competed for a full scholarship to one of the country's top design schools, the Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising in Los Angeles, and other prizes. Getting to a winner was gut-wrenching for the judges, considering children are involved. When they got down to the final six, emotions ran extra high, Gunn said. "The judges and I didn't want to eliminate anyone at that point and said, 'Can we just send all six of them forward to the finale? Please? Please!" Producers nixed that idea, as they did Gunn's Plan B of trimming the final six to four by letting the two kids cut leave together, hand in hand. "With the grown-ups on 'Runway,"' Gunn said, "it's like, 'Don't let the door hit you on the way out!" — AP

■he ruble's weak. The warnings about a complicated visa process were wrong, at least with a travel agency's help. And current geopolitical tensions make this a good time to temper headlines about Russia with everyday people and places. Consider the prices, at least outside the summer tourist rush: A round-trip air ticket between New York and the lovely St Petersburg this fall was less than \$600, and winter prices are looking about the same. Hostel beds start at around \$6. A balcony ticket to the ballet at the famous Mariinsky Theatre is about \$10. Tickets for most runs of the high-speed, four-hour train between St Petersburg and Moscow are around

Three weeks of exploring western Russia left me with the following impressions, along with a number of useful words and phrases. By the way, make the effort to learn the Cyrillic alphabet, which doesn't take long. It helps in getting adjusted and in buying tickets for the train, which is the best, and most social, way of

Gdye? (where?)

St Petersburg makes for a soft landing in Russia. Peter the Great's vision of a Europe-facing nation plays out here among the miles of canals, the fantastic art-filled Hermitage overlooking the Neva River and a younger generation more comfortable with the world abroad. The Soul Kitchen hostel, which overlooks one of the city's waterways, has both dorm and private rooms and thoughtful touches like freshly baked apple cake in the collective kitchen every morning and classical music playing in the bathroom. Highly recommended.

A nice surprise was Kaliningrad, a fragment of Russia tucked between Poland and Lithuania on the Baltic Sea for which I found same-day flights for as low as \$40 from Moscow. I easily filled a couple of days with a bus tour for about \$17 to the Curonian Spit, a fragile sand dune peninsula on the UNESCO World Heritage List, and with places like Kvartira, a cafe-art spot in an apartment building that would hold its own in Brooklyn. Don't be surprised if people try speaking to you in German, as Kaliningrad was once the German city of Konigsberg.

Chto? (what?)

Art, more art, Orthodox churches, urban exploration and cherry dumplings. A bluff overlooking the Volga River is about as much altitude this part of Russia offers, so go for the culture instead of the sweeping views. Moscow has plenty to offer beyond its high-end shopping and nightclubs. Be prepared for long weekend lines of art lovers at both branches of the State Tretyakov Gallery. And there's always the Kremlin

In St Petersburg, the Russian Museum is a worthy afternoon if the Hermitage left you wanting more, and the Erarta museum is a good collection of more modern art with the rare benefit of detailed descriptions in both Russian and English.

Heritage tourism: Using travel to explore roots and culture

uong La's family fled the communist regime in Vietnam in 1979. Now a father of three living in Santa Barbara, California, he and his wife decided they wanted to spend one of their family vacations bringing the kids back to his native country to learn about it. So they spent a month on a heritage tourism trip to the Southeast Asian country to visit not just traditional tourist sites but also the

places where he had grown up in the Mekong Delta. "My husband thought that by seeing the places he had grown up in, the kids would have a better understanding of him," said Luong's wife, Michelle Robin La. "My husband's extended family keeps their heritage alive in America with food, language and celebrations like the Lunar New Year. By traveling in Vietnam for a month we immersed the kids in the place these traditions came from." Their family trip to Vietnam is an example of heritage tourism, which The National Trust for Historic Preservation defines as traveling to experience a place, artifacts and activities that authentically represent the stories and people of the past and pres-

Authentic experiences

Heritage tourism sites can be as varied as a revitalized downtown or a Civil War trail. "For a number of years, the idea was to build interstates and get people to where they're going and then people gradually began to realize they were missing out on something - authentic experiences," said Carolyn Brackett with The National Trust for Historic Preservation's Cultural Heritage Program. "And that's a word that we hear over and over that people want a feeling of authenticity, meaning they want a sense of place."

As travelers became more interested in authentic experiences, communities and officials are taking notice, asking what they can do to share their story, Brackett said. A 2013 national survey conducted by Mandala Research showed that 76 percent of all leisure travelers in the US will take part in some sort of cultural or heritage activity while they are traveling, Brackett said. That translates to 130 million people.

Tourism boards and sites are taking note. In Oklahoma, the state's Tourism and Recreation Department has released a guide and web portal about the state's African-American history and heritage sites. The Texas Historical Commission has released a free 100-page guide showcasing the state's Hispanic heritage sites. Aside from well-known destinations like the Alamo, the Texas guide, which is organized by geographic regions and was released in May, includes off-the-beaten path sites as well, said Chris Florance, spokesman for the Texas Historical Commission. "The Hispanic cultures have left their imprint on the state for 500 years, and it has impacted almost every aspect of Texas culture - certainly our history, architecture, music. It's just such a vital and important part of our history and where we are today and where we're going as a state," he said. The commission has also released a mobile app so visitors can access thematic tours, including one focused on African-American heritage sites in Texas.

Family's heritage

"There's an enormous interest in heritage tourism. It's a really important part of Texas' tourist economy," he said, adding that an economic impact study found that about 10 percent of travtaken several trips based around cultural heritage, most notably a trip to Ireland and England to see stone formations and other ancient sites. Thompson's ancestors were Queen Victoria's Irish bodyguards, she said, and she describes herself as being more interested in museums, history and culture than in other types

Thompson's grandfather emigrated from Czechoslovakia and she next hopes to take a trip to the region to learn more about that part of her family's heritage. "All travel enriches your life, but the contrived travel - the Vegas and the Disneyland and all of that - just doesn't appeal to me as much as it does really thinking I have ancestors or people in my lineage who came and possibly could have stayed here before," said Thompson, who lives in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and is the creative director for Heritage Hotels & Resorts, a group of hotels that showcase New Mexico's history, art and culture. "I think it's just a deeper, holistic experience for travel."— AP



Blaming the Kalash for northwest Pakistar

onservative Muslims in Pakistan's northwest are blaming the animist Kalash for a powerful earthquake that flattened entire villages in October, claiming their immoral ways provoked Allah's wrath, in the latest attack on a diminishing tribe fighting to keep its identity alive. Residents of Chitral district are still reeling from the 7.5 magnitude quake, which ripped through Afghanistan and Pakistan killing more than 390 people and leveling thousands of homes. It came just three months after floods also devastated Chitral, leaving thousands of families camping in the open as winter approaches.

Chitral's verdant, plunging valleys have long attracted tourists for their natural beauty and their brush with legend as the home of the ancient, polytheistic Kalash, many of whom are fair with light-coloured eyes. Pakistan's smallest religious minority, they speak their own language and celebrate their gods through music, dance-and alcohol, which they brew themselves for rituals and consumption, but many Muslims in the region feel Allah, angered by such un-Islamic practices, has smited the region with natural disasters.

"People are saying that the earthquake came because of the Kalash," says student Shira Bibi, who spoke to AFP in the village of Brun, nestled in the Bumburate area of the valleys. Shira's direct gaze and confident, melodic way of speaking are typical of Kalash women but distinctive in conservative, patriarchal Pakistan. Her face is uncovered and her clothing, a deep black, is intricately embroidered across the shoulders, as is the wide belt slung across her waist. Her long, dark hair is braided beneath a beaded headpiece-in the traditional Kalash style. Shira, who studies at a college in Chitral town some 100 kilometres (60 miles) away, came back to Brun after the quake.

"An old man in Chitral town said 'Look, daughter,

don't walk around like that, don't you see earthquakes are striking, floods are coming, because of you?" Shira said. "I was wearing Kalash dress when he said this. People keep saying things like that."

The 'superior religion'

Academics have speculated the Kalash might be descended from the ancient Middle East or even from soldiers of Alexander the Great's army, which conquered the area in the fourth century BC. Centuries ago they ruled Chitral but now they are a minority in the valleys, with their population reduced to just a third of the 12,000 residents, according to the Kalash Peoples Development Network (KPDN), a local organization. KPDN chair Luke Rehmat said the Kalash are being subjected to "institutional conversion".


"The Kalash people are being discouraged in society and told to get rid of their religion in a systematic way," he said. Until this year, Kalash was not recognized as a religion under the National Database and Registration Authority, and Rehmat says that in schools Kalash are given no alternative to Islamic studies. "In other parts of Pakistan non-Muslims have ethics as a subject in lieu of Islamic studies, but here the students have no choice." Teachers in Kalash tell the students that Islam is a "superior religion", he said, branding it "brainwashing".

"Ultimately when they grow up, they don't have knowledge of their own Kalash culture and traditions, religions. And they are turning to other sides." Up to 100 Kalash have converted to Islam in the past few years, according to Rehmat, sometimes causing a strange family dynamic. Diana Bibi, who lives in Brun, has an elder sister who converted to Islam and married in Peshawar. Now her sibling wears a niqab even when visiting her parents in Kalash, and refuses to attend the family's religious ceremonies. "It's a big problem." Diana said. Asked if she might also convert, Diana giggles: "Yes! I will go to heaven and have 70 virgins."

Suffering for Kalash sins

Osama Ahmad Warraich, Chitral deputy commissioner, denies any Kalash are being forced to become Muslim. "They are basically poor people belonging to a low income group and people from other parts of the country give them money to convert," he tells AFP-in particular, "rich Muslims who want to marry Kalash girls". He also says the government is carrying out a number of local projects to help preserve Kalash culture, including donating land for a graveyard and recognizing their economic potential. "We are trying to revive tourism in the region by preserving the Kalash culture as it's the best tourist attraction in the country," he says.

Zafar, a Kalash who goes by only one name, said not all Muslims in the valleys blame his tribe for the disasters. "The trend of discouraging Kalash people from practicing their faith is very old and I would not blame all Muslims for it, neither do all the Muslims here see the Kalash as being behind all the doom and destruction," he said. However villager Nazai Gai said locals will not stop blaming his fellow Kalash for the disasters. "Three months back Allah saw the Kalash practicing their faith and there was a flood, then he saw them again and there was an earthquake. In a month he will see them again and there will be a blizzard in the valley," he said with a sardonic grin. Later adding quizzically: "Why would Allah make Muslims suffer for the sins of the Kalash?"-AFP
