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KUWAITI PAVILION WINS AWARD FOR **CONSTRUCTION ART**

MILAN: The Kuwaiti pavilion at Expo Milan 2015 has won the international award for construction art; selected as one of the top lucrative display corners at the international fairground, garnering more than double the votes the Italian pavilion got, which came second. The award steering body said on its website that the Kuwaiti pavilion drew admiration of the majority of voters, garnering 20.73 percent of the votes for distinguished architectural design among 54 pavilions.

The Kuwaiti stands got more than a fifth of the votes, more than double those given to the Italian corner, which took 9.67 percent. Brazil, in the weeks-long contest, got 9.35 percent of the votes, coming third, followed by Britain with 7.17 percent and then Bahrain with 4.95 percent. The award for the most impressive pavilion is due to be delivered at the final ceremony on Oct 31. It will be attended by the Italian premier and representatives of 145 participating countries.

The contest is organized by the Italian National Institute of Architecture, the national construction association, the Italian National Association of Architects and Builders, designers of projects

AMMAN: US Secretary of State John Kerry said yesterday that Israel and Jordan have agreed on steps aimed at reducing tensions at a holy site in Jerusalem that have fanned Israeli-Palestinian violence. "All the violence and the incitement to violence must stop. Leaders must lead," Kerry told reporters in the Jordanian capital after meeting King Abdullah II and Palestinian leader Mahmoud Abbas. The top US diplomat said the steps include round-the-clock video monitoring and Israel's reaffirming of Jordan's special and historic role as custodian of the site, known to Muslims as the Haram Al-Sharif and to Jews as the Temple Mount. The king suggested the monitoring, according to Kerry, and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu accepted.

Israel has pledged to maintain the rules of worship at the site, and Israeli and Jordanian authorities will meet about bolstering security, Kerry said. Netanyahu's office had no immediate comment. The US and Jordan expected him to talk about the situation late Saturday night. Palestinian officials and representatives from the Islamic religious authority that oversees the compound were awaiting details and declined comment. Kerry later flew to Saudi Arabia and met King Salman in Riyadh.

Kerry, who met with Netanyahu in Berlin on Thursday, said the leaders "expressed their strong commitment to ending the violence and restoring the calm as soon as possible". "I hope that based on these conversations we can finally put to rest some of the false assumptions, perceptions" about the holy site, Kerry said. "Those perceptions are stoking the tensions and fueling the violence and it is important for us to end the provocative rhetoric and start to change the public narrative that comes out of those false perceptions."

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AL-BABTAIN: TERRORISM BELONGS TO NO RELIGION

OXFORD: Chairman of Abdulaziz Saud wars and to provide dignified living Al-Babtain Cultural Foundation, Poet Abdulaziz Saud Al-Babtain, said that terrorism belongs to no religion and that it exploits discrimination and absence of justice. Al-Babtain made the statement yesterday at the opening of the Foundation's 15th session organized at Oxford in cooperation with the University's Middle East Center and the UN Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC).

He added that the 15th session comes at a time when the world is suffering from an unprecedented wave of terrorism and devastating civil wars that have led the world to be overwhelmed by refugees. It is our responsibility to combat terrorism and dry up its sources through targeting its roots, he stressed, noting that the phenomenon has reached countries that believed they were far from it. He urged the UN and the major countries to intensify cooperation to stem civil conditions for the refugees. Al-Babtain called for freedom for the Palestinian people who are facing "horrible tyranny and hateful racism."

Freedom for the Palestinian people is an ethical challenge to the world's conscience and a test to the credibility of countries' respect to human rights, he said. He also expressed pleasure that the event brings together people of various countries, nationalities and faiths under the theme of a "shared world." Meanwhile, the leading poet said that Al-Babtain Cultural Foundation realized more than quarter of a century ago that bridging the gap and extending bridges among the different spheres is a sacred mission and a top necessity that has to see no delay.

Amir honored

Abdulaziz Saud Al-Babtain Cultural Foundation honored yesterday His Highness the Amir of Kuwait Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah by publishing a commemorative book documenting His Highness the Amir's and the Kuwaiti people's charitable and humanitarian work. MOSQUE BLAST TRIAL RESUMES

KUWAIT: The Court of Appeals resumes today the trial of defendants involved in the blast of Imam Al-Sadeg Mosque that took place on June 26 and left 26 worshippers killed and 227 others wounded. The Criminal Court had sentenced seven suspects to death, eight to 2-15 years in prison, but acquitted another 15 suspects. The defendants are accused of spreading terror, committing murder, joining an internationally-banned group that promotes toppling the ruling system with illegitimate means, namely terrorism, thus threatening the country's national unity. The court had held its first session on the explosion on August 4th, to look into the cases presented against seven Kuwaiti defendants, five Saudis, three Pakistanis, 13 illegal residents and one fugitive with unidentified nationality.

The Public Prosecution had demanded tough sentences against the defendants, as the prosecution's representative had presented thorough details on the case. They also provided visual evidence on the role of the 29 defendants in the blast, including hiding vital evidence and helping the driver, Abdulrahman Eidan, to escape. The Imam Al-Sadeq Mosque in Kuwait City was attacked by a suicide bomber on June 26th during the weekly Friday prayer in the holy month of Ramadan, killing 26 people and injuring 227 others. The blast sparked wide-scale condemnations from Arab, Muslim and world countries which rejected all forms and manifestations of terrorism. -KUNA

KTV keeping up with the times

hose who were in Kuwait during the Iraqi invasion in 1990 still remember TV anchor and newsreader Yousef Mostafa. Today, he is the Assistant Undersecretary for TV Affairs at the Ministry of Information, and still represents the ministry at various official events. Mostafa spoke to Kuwait Times about various issues, starting with explaining the role and responsibilities of the ministry. "The ministry of information includes various sectors, out of which the TV sector is the largest, with eight channels that broadcast 24 hours a day.

These include KTV 1, KTV satellite, Channel 2, which addresses two-thirds of the local population, two sports channels - one for the youth and the other for sporting events, the Arabi satellite channel for culture and arts, Ithra'a for religious issues and Kuwait Plus, which is parallel to KTV 1. Each of these channels has its own audience depending on their interests," he told Kuwait Times. Mostafa, before assuming his current post two and a half years ago, was the assistant undersecretary for news and political programs for a year. Prior to that, he was the undersecretary for Kuwait Radio for a year and half. Before that, he was a TV anchor for many years. Mostafa has won many local and regional awards during a career spanning 35 years, which has made him capable to run any department at the ministry of information.

During the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait in 1990, Kuwaiti Radio was broadcasting under the slogan 'Here is Kuwait' (Huna Al Kuwait). Mostafa was one of those who soldiered on from Aug 1 till the liberation on Feb 26, 1991. "At that time, Kuwaiti media was much respected around the world. Kuwait Radio didn't stop broadcasting, and we shifted from Kuwait to Saudi Arabia on the fifth day of invasion, and received full support from them. They provided the facilities for us to be able to broadcast. Also, the TV channel was aired from Saudi Arabia during the seven months of the invasion," he recounted. "We announced the liberation of the Kuwaiti islands first and returned to the ministry of information. The studios were damaged by the Iragis and they had ransacked and stolen the national radio and TV archives. Fortunately, we were able to reconstruct what was destroyed, and we gained international respect," Mostafa recalled. Other excerpts from the interview:

KT: What's new at KTV? Tell us about future plans.

Mostafa: Several engineering projects have been executed, as well as establishing broadcast centers and new stations that work with the high definition (HD) system, which is the technology currently used for satellite broadcasting internationally. All Kuwait channels will be broadcast on both Nilesat and Arabsat, so viewers all over the world will be able to watch these channels in







Kuwait Times: What do you have to say to some producers of TV programs who have complained of corruption in the ministry and particularly the TV sector?

Yousef Mostafa: This is not true anymore, especially after Sheikh Salman Al-Homoud was appointed minister of information and state minister for youth affairs. Sheikh Salman rectified the mistakes in all the sectors of the ministry and not just the TV department. The change at Kuwait TV is noticeable in all its channels and new content. The executive committee chooses submitted works carefully, as the minister included representatives from various bodies in this committee as members, including finance, planning and development, legal, higher institute for theatre arts and the artists' association. The committee chooses the most suitable works according to the official media

vision, which then receive financial and media support.

KT: What about censorship?

Mostafa: We have active censorship for TV - a censorship committee monitors all broadcasts. We are glad that families can safely watch all KTV channels without being worried that their children may see any inappropriate content. Whatever is broadcast is in line with our customs and traditions. Censorship of local dramas is done before and during the shooting, after producing them and while showing them. A team from KTV attends the shooting at various locations, and if they notice any violations in the contract or mistakes, the makers will be informed to correct them. They are usually very cooperative, so we don't register any violations.

high quality. KTV can compete with the best satellite channels. We will even switch to a system newer than HD soon. According to many surveys, KTV is still one of the leading channels and has many local and Arab viewers because of the various dramas and cultural, religious, touristic and development programs shown.

KT: What about content for non-Arabic speak-

Mostafa: KTV 2 has changed its strategy, which was appreciated by non-Arab viewers through their feedback. This channel also broadcasts some programs and news shown on KTV 1. As a new addition, we have started translating and dubbing some local dramas and soap operas to give the opportunity for these viewers to enjoy watching them. Even some folk songs have been translated.



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


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KUWAIT KEEN ON BOOSTING COOPERATION WITH FAO

ROME: Kuwait's Minister of Oil Dr Ali Al-Omair affirmed Kuwait's keenness on boosting cooperation with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and employing its expertise in bolstering food security and executing sustainable development plans in agriculture at the national level. Minister Dr Al-Omair expressed admiration toward FAO's role in resolving global problems such as hunger, malnutrition and poverty as well as encouraging states to devote attention to sustainable development in agriculture and food production for realizing food securi-

The minister made this statement to Kuwait News Agency as he concluded his visit to Italy during which he held talks with FAO's Director-General Jos Graziano da Silva. Al-Omair said his cordial meeting with Da Silva was an opportunity to affirm Kuwait's keenness on developing the agricultural sector and achieving food security, noting the State's commitment to aiding countries that suffer from hunger and poverty-in coordination with the international community.

This policy has prompted the UN to designate His Highness the Amir as the "Humanitarian Leader," as well as Kuwait as the "Humanitarian Center." He indicated that the talks with the FAO chief dealt with prospected cooperation deals, adding that Da Silva pledged to visit Kuwait soon to examine the areas where the international organization could contribute and offer aid. There is a plan to call one of the conference halls at the organization's headquarters after the name of His Highness the Amir, Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

The minister indicated that he had examined the hall, noting determination to "overcome some obstacles to carry out this initiative that will lift the name of Kuwait aloft at the quarters of one of the oldest international organizations." Dr Al-Omair stated that Kuwait is proud of dealing with FAO which has been seeking to boost food security. 

Around 2006-2007, some Western studies appeared to call for the establishment of a new Islamic trend, described as moderate Muslim groups, to face hardline currents for a kind of democratic transformation in the Arab world, but they proved to be unable to be a suitable alternative because they lacked support and acceptance in their communities. Another problem with liberals and secularists is that their views are not welcome by Islamist militant movements. For example, in Egypt and with the success of the Muslim Brotherhood in reaching power, the liberals lost. The Palestinian National Authority also lost in 2006 in favor of Hamas. The fall of Islamist organizations is neither quick nor easy.

So how to confront Islamist organizations that are widespread now in the west and east? There is no immediate solution, but there are means to undermine their power within the society and challenge them by spreading democratic ideas, which means essentially rejecting the idea of an Islamic state. Also by cutting all means of cooperation, communication and financial resources on which the militants depend, control everyone and meddle in the land and people. The press is a powerful instrument, and can play a role to help civil governments protect themselves and reshape public opinion.



I agree with what was said, and I previously wrote about this, which regretfully is a truth that cannot be denied, yet all this should be explained as a "gift",

especially that the Iranian policy, during the latest stage, is not steady and does not reflect a promising friendship with the neighboring Gulf countries, and any danger that affects Saudi Arabia affects Kuwait for sure, especially from a geographical aspect.

We hope that Iran does not interpret the differences in some Gulf countries' stands for its interest or that they may, one day, turn against Saudi Arabia, because this is a grave political mistake. The Iranian policy, especially the accusations and descriptions against Saudi Arabia with regards to the Mina accident, is a rejected stand by Kuwait in the first place.

The difference in the stands of GCC countries has been clear for years as I said, and it needs quick mending and rescue within a joint understanding towards the dangers that are threatening the GCC countries' security, yet Iran should not count on these differences for its interest, especially while Iran continues to declare its "ambitions" and interferences in Gulf neighbors' affairs, in addition to surrounding Arab countries!

We hope for a joint Gulf support for dialogue and negotiations with Iran in the interest of good neighborliness and stability.



Kuwait MoH considers regulating abortions

KUWAIT: Health Ministry Assistant Undersecretary for the Private Sector Dr Mohammed Al-Khashti said that the ministry is currently considering amending law number 25/1981 pertaining the practice of medicine. Khashti added that the articles proposed for amendment include those regulating abortions and the penalties imposed on those violating them, be they doctors or officials at any health facilities. However, Khashti preferred not to go into further details until the study is completed.

Allow expats to own houses: Kuwait MP

KUWAIT: Municipal Council member Ali Al-Moussa has made a proposal to attract foreign investors to Kuwait and allowing expats settled in Kuwait to own houses here. "Foreign investors must be allowed to own houses in new areas," said Moussa, pointing out that many non-Kuwaiti merchants are eager to settle in Kuwait, urging the municipal council to allocate land to build houses to be owned by expats.

Fuel prices may go up by 69-88%

KUWAIT: High-ranking oil sources said if subsidies are gradually lifted, a proposal was made to the subsidies committee suggesting increasing petrol prices to 110 fils per liter for 'special' fuel compared to the current price of 65 fils - a 69 percent increase; and increasing the ultra gas price to 170 fils per liter compared to the current price of 90 fils - an 88 percent increase. The sources added that if the committee decides lifting subsidies completely, fuel prices would jump to 250 fils per liter, as previously suggested by the oil ministry. The sources said fuel prices would be variable on a monthly basis according to oil prices, adding to this was the proposal most likely to be put into practice and stressed that the government would partially lift subsidies to avoid rapid inflation. "The committee will submit its final report by the end of December," stressed the sources. — Agencies

MALDIVES ARRESTS VEEP OVER PLOT TO KILL PRESIDENT

MALE, Maldives: Maldives Vice President Ahmed Adeeb was arrested yesterday over last month's alleged attempt to assassinate President Abdulla Yameen in a bomb blast on board his speedboat, the government said. Adeeb's dramatic arrest at the Maldives' main international airport followed "extensive investigations by both local and international agencies," the government said in a statement posted on the website of its high commission in New Delhi. "The charges are extremely serious, and the government has had to act decisively," it said, without saying whether the vice president had been formally charged.

Home Minister Umar Naseer earlier posted on Twitter that Adeeb was in detention on Dhoonidhoo prison island. "Charges: high treason," he tweeted. Adeeb, 33, was arrested at around noon local time (0700 GMT) yesterday as he returned home from Singapore, where he had stopped over after attending an investment forum in China. Maldivian police confirmed his detention was linked to an investigation into the Sept 28 blast aboard Yameen's speedboat, which left the leader unhurt but his wife and two others slightly injured.

Adeeb was unceremoniously escorted away by police as he disembarked from a Singapore Airlines flight, with a coastguard boat taking him to the nearby prison island of Dhoonidhoo. Dozens of Adeeb's supporters who had arrived at the official jetty in Male to greet him were turned back by police in the tiny 2.5-sq-km capital island.

By afternoon, the authorities had deployed soldiers and police to maintain calm, while special police units carried out searches at houses and offices frequented by the detained vice president. "Security in Male has been tightened," police spokesman Abdulla Nawaz told reporters in the capital where more than a dozen people were arrested for disturbing public order. "Police won't allow any violence in the capital city. Both police and the army will be deployed to patrol the streets of Male."

Official sources said four of the vice president's associates were arrested shortly before Adeeb's detention and were also being held on the prison island. Yameen appointed Adeeb as his deputy three months ago after impeaching his original running mate Mohamed Jameel on charges of treason. He had changed the Maldives' constitution to reduce the permissible age of a vice president from 35 to

30 so that Adeeb could be given the job. Adeeb, who had a meteoric rise in politics, was also a hate figure for the country's main opposition, which accused him of sending underworld gangs to launch attacks against dissidents.


'Purge' of Ministers

Hours before the arrest yesterday, the president sacked his police chief Hussain Waheed, the latest in a series of firings seen by some as a purge of individuals whose loyalties may be in doubt. Defence Minister Moosa Ali Jaleel was sacked 10 days ago, while on Thursday Yameen also fired his main government spokesman Mohamed Shareef, a minister in his cabinet. Shareef, who flew to nearby Sri Lanka soon after the Sept 28 blast, said the explosion may have been a mechanical issue, but the authorities later declared it to be an assassination attempt.

The ruling Progressive Party of Maldives - of which Adeeb is deputy leader - said in a statement it backed the president in the "challenging times". Yameen will not be able to sack Adeeb unless he gets the support of opposition legislators in the national parliament. Earlier in October authorities arrested two security personnel who had access to Yameen's boat but have yet to disclose what caused the explosion.

The Maldives has seen its image as a peaceful holiday destination for well heeled honeymooners dented by political turmoil since the toppling of the country's first democratically elected leader Mohamed Nasheed in Feb 2012. Yameen, who came to power in November 2013 following a highly controversial election, jailed Nasheed for 13 years in March and faces international censure over his crackdown on dissent.

A UN panel last month asked Yameen to free Nasheed and pay him compensation for his wrongful incarceration, a demand the president rejected. Yameen's half brother, former Maldivian strongman Maumoon Abdul Gayoom who is now a senior leader of the PPM, cancelled a scheduled visit to India following Adeeb's arrest.—AFP



CLINTON IN COMMAND AFTER 'QUITE A WEEK'

ALEXANDRIA, VIRGINIA: It's been a great week for Hillary Clinton. First, Democratic rival Joe Biden abandoned his presidential dreams. Then she emerged unscathed from a marathon congressional grilling over the 2012 Benghazi attacks that threatened to sabotage her campaign - but now looks to be a boost. Throw in her star turn at the first Democratic debate 10 days ago, when she gave a command performance and received a political gift from rival Bernie Sanders who declared America had heard enough about her "damn emails", and Clinton appears to be on a glide path to the party's presidential nomination.

In addition to the vice president opting out, low-polling candidates Jim Webb and Lincoln Chafee also stepped aside this week, and Clinton has seen her poll average surge seven points in October, after a months-long slide. Adding to the bounty, on Friday she earned the endorsement of AFSCME, a 1.6-millionmember labor union. The bouquet of political successes came as welcome relief for the former secretary of state aiming to become America's first female commander-in-chief, and she appeared to exult in her decidedly improved position Friday.

"Whoa," she exclaimed as she received a hero's welcome at a women's leadership forum in Washington. "It's been guite a week, hasn't it?" No question. Even her one-time rivals see the writing on the wall, with Chafee using the same forum to announce he was quitting the race. "There is no one left," said David Parker, a

professor of American politics at Montana State University, dismissing democratic socialist Sanders as unelectable and former Maryland governor Martin O'Malley as failing to gain any traction. "There is no doubt in my mind that Clinton will be the nominee" he told AFP

President Barack Obama's first secretary of state topped off her wonder week by basking in the warmth of a receptive crowd at a rally outside Washington, brimming with renewed confidence. "A lot of things have been said about me but 'quitter' isn't one of them," she said, after highlighting her 11-hour testimony the previous day. And she stressed that her campaign - while acknowledging the successes of Democratic predecessors - was all about

"I'm not running for President Obama's third term, I'm not running for Bill Clinton's third term. I'm running for my first term!" she said to a loud roar. Her campaign team wasted no time pushing the post-Benghazi-hearing narrative of Clinton the "fighter". "Republicans and others have tried to test her and Hillary Clinton is battle-ready," spokesman Brian Fallon told reporters. When asked whether the grueling hearing was a waste of time, Clinton told MSNBC Friday that she agreed to participate "because if there is anything new, which is unlikely after the eight prior investigations that have been held, we should know about it." Afterwards, "I had my whole team come over to my house, and we sat around eating Indian food and drinking wine and beer" she said.

'Coming Back'

Ripping a page from husband Bill's neversay-die playbook, Clinton - who led Obama early in their 2008 rivalry only to see him snatch the nomination - may be proving that she too can be the comeback kid. Just a few weeks ago, her poll numbers were worryingly low-she was tied with Sanders in Iowa, the state that votes first in the 2016 primary race, and trailing him by double digits in New Hampshire, which votes second.

Bill Clinton suffered early voter rejection in 1992, losing 10 of the first 11 primaries before turning things around to win the nomination and then complete a stunning upset over incumbent president George H W Bush. Hillary Clinton, 67, appears to be repairing damage before the first primary votes. She has closed the Sanders gap in New Hampshire and, according to a Quinnipiac University poll released Friday, has opened an 11-point lead over Sanders in Iowa.

She is riding high after her performance Thursday, when House Republicans interrogated her over her role in responding to the 2012 attacks in Benghazi, Libya that left four Americans dead. Clinton maintained her cool and emerged unscathed - to the relief of Democrats at the Virginia rally. "I agree that it was kind of a rough summer, but she's kind of coming back. She appeared very presidential," said Jeremy Dickie, 24, who works for a nonprofit in Washington.

Some Republicans even conceded that Clinton had performed admirably. New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, running near the back of the Republican presidential pack, panned lawmakers as "ineffective" at dinging Clinton. "She helped herself yesterday. They didn't uncover anything new," he told Fox News.

Clinton Friday also shook off recent comments by Republican congressman Mo Brooks, who said the former US chief diplomat should be impeachment on her first day in office if she is elected president. "Isn't that pathetic? It's just laughable. It's so totally ridiculous," Clinton told

RUSSIA OFFERS AIR COVER FOR ANTI-ASSAD REBELS

Moscow wants Damascus to prepare elections

MOSCOW: Russia said yesterday it was ready to provide air support for Western-backed moderate rebels battling both jihadists and Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad as Moscow presses on with its diplomatic offensive over the conflict. Speaking after a surprise summit between Syria's embattled leader and Russian President Vladimir Putin at the Kremlin this week, Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov urged moves towards presidential and parliamentary polls in the war-torn country.

Representatives of Syria's Western-backed opposition sounded incredulous, saying Russia should first stop bombing moderate rebels and that talk of elections was premature. On the ground, Syrian troops backed by Russian air strikes battled fighters from the Islamic State (IS) group in a bid to restore a key supply line to second city Aleppo, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. At least 28 IS fighters and 21 troops and pro-regime militia have been killed in the battle for

the road leading to the government-held part of Aleppo, it said. The monitors also reported Russian strikes in northern Hama province and said six people. including three children, were killed in what was believed to be a Russian strike on the village of Al-Bargun in Aleppo province. Russia and the West have been at loggerheads over Assad's fate, a major sticking point in efforts to solve a crisis that has killed more than . 250,000 people since 2011 and sparked an exodus of around four million refugees.

Seeking to shake off months of Western isolation over the Ukraine conflict, Putin last month launched air strikes in Syria and has since launched negotiations with the war's key regional players, including some of Assad's worst enemies, such as Saudi Arabia and Turkey. But Washington has accused Moscow of seeking to buttress Assad by bombing moderate rebels in Syria, and refused to share intelligence over Syria.

A Shift in Russia's Position?

Analysts say Lavrov's offer of support for the anti-Assad opposition in the fight against IS could point to a shift in the Kremlin's position. "We are ready to also support patriotic opposition, including the so-called Free Syrian Army, from the air," Lavroy said in an interview with the Rossiya 1 television channel. Russia has previously only used the words "patriotic" or "healthy" to describe groups backing Assad.

Moscow says it has struggled to identify areas controlled by moderate rebels and has urged the West to help build bridges. The Russian government released the transcript of the interview after Lavrov and US Secretary of State John Kerry agreed in Vienna on Friday to explore new ways of trying to reach a political settlement. Lavrov, who spoke to Kerry again yesterday, also said the huge influx of migrants to Europe - many of them Syrian refugees - had helped shift EU politicians' thinking, which could potentially lead the way to fresh talks on Syria's future. "Of course, it's necessary to prepare for both parliamentary and presidential polls," Lavrov added.

'We Don't Understand Russia'

Western-backed Syrian rebels rejected Russia's offer of help under current circumstances. "Russia is bombing the Free Syrian Army and now it wants to cooperate with us, while it remains committed to Assad?" said Lieutenant Colonel Ahmad Saoud, a spokesman for the Division 13 rebel group. "We don't understand Russia at all!" But things could be different if Assad quits power, he suggested. "In the event that Assad leaves, there is a transitional government, a ceasefire and the formation of a national army to serve its country, we will try to forget the pain in order to build our country."

Samir Nashar, a member of the Syrian National Coalition, the opposition's main political body, said the proposal of new elections was absurd and accused Moscow of trying "to circumvent the demands of the Syrian people for Assad's departure". Syria last held presidential elections in June 2014, with Assad re-elected for a seven-year term with 88.7 percent of the vote. The election was dismissed by the opposition and condemned internationally.

'Things Resolve Themselves'

Some analysts say Moscow may not be married to the idea of Assad staying in power indefinitely, with others suggesting the Kremlin may be nudging the disgraced leader to share power. Jeremy Binnie, Middle East editor at IHS Jane's Defence Weekly, said Putin wants to see a settlement in Syria and is "prepared to retire Bashar al-Assad to achieve that goal". Washington and its allies say there is no role for Assad in the future, although some of them have said recently his resignation need not be immediate. Putin has stressed that Assad's fate should be decided by the people and said Russia's possible support for the moderate rebels was agreed with the Syrian leader. — AFP

CHECKPOINTS STIR PALESTINIAN ANGER IN EASTERN JERUSALEM

JERUSALEM: Until recently it took Abu Amr four minutes to drive his son to school. Now, because of security checkpoints aimed at combating a wave of attacks on Israelis, it takes 40. Concrete blocks and partitions have been set up around his Palestinian neighborhood of Jabel Mukaber, which came under the spotlight earlier this month when police said the killers of three Israelis were residents of the area. To pass through these new obstacles in occupied east Jerusalem, Abu Amr must abandon his car and go on foot, but only after identity and other checks.

Men must lift their shirts to show they are not carrying a weapon or a bomb. Women must open their bags to be searched by police. Responding to attacks in which eight Israelis have died so far this month, Israeli security forces have deployed into Palestinian areas and erected obstacles to control residents' movements. The United Nations says that 38 barriers, including 17 checkpoints, have sprung up in nine Palestinian neighborhoods, disrupting the daily lives of at least 138,000 Palestinians.

On a recent day, Abu Amr. 34 to pick up the boy from school and take him to a doctor's appointment. He was running late and fuming at "the collective punishment which is the manifestation of the racist discrimination" by Israel in east Jerusalem. The mainly-Arab eastern sector was seized by Israel during the 1967 Six Day War and later annexed in a move never internationally recognized. Since the beginning of October, Palestinian-Israeli unrest has spiked across the occupied territories but it is in east Jerusalem where Palestinians "pay the highest price," Abu Amr says. Jabel Mukaber was home to three Palestinians who allegedly killed three Israelis in two separate attacks in Jerusalem before being killed by security forces. Israeli authorities started building a wall there this week to create a buffer for an adjacent Jewish neighborhood where "there is a history of stone and firebomb throwing at Jewish homes and cars," the municipality said. Work on the barrier, which was to have run for 300 m, soon ground to a halt amid internal Israeli political squabbles but Palestinian residents remain fearful. "What do they want to do with the wall if not to isolate

our neighbourhood?" asks Tareq Auissat. The 24-year-old bus driver says that the section already erected stops him taking passengers more than 500 m. "I drop them at a checkpoint then they take another bus," from the other side to

east Jerusalem's city centre. "Normally the journey takes 25 minutes," he adds. "Now with the roadblocks and searches you need to allow an hour or 90 min-In the Issawiya neighbourhood stand

identical concrete blocks and armed soldiers block all roads in. "Every day we're late for university or school," says 19year-old student Mumen Rabi. "We're late for everything. It's a punishment inflicted on all the residents of Issawiya." It comes, locals say, on top of decades of discrimination and marginalization of Palestinians in Jerusalem, where more than 300,000 of them live. Construction is almost impossible because building permits are issued by Israel in a trickle, while demolition of unlicenced Palestinian homes increases. Among them live 200,000 Israeli settlers, encouraged to build because Israel considers Jerusalem as its "eternal and indivisible

'Stuck in the 15th Century'

The Israeli municipal council officially manages all of the city but its services actually stop at the edge of the Palestinian neighborhoods. The Palestinians living there are almost entirely designated as residents rather than citizens. They do not have the vote in national Israeli elections nor do they hold Israeli passports, travelling instead on documents issued by neighboring Jordan. "We pay taxes... but no one is interested in us," says Abu Amr. "Infrastructure in the east (of the city) is zero! We have no social care, no education, no development, no economy. We don't have job security either."

Mohammed Abu Al-Homos, a member of the Issawiya neighborhood council, points to the street sweepers busy at work in the neighboring Jewish colony of French Hill. "Here, they do nothing at all, while there, they clean the pavements." Palestinian cartographer Khalil Tufakji says the two sides of the holy city occupy parallel universes. "West Jerusalem lives in the 21st century, but east Jerusalem is stuck in the 15th century,' he tells AFP. To move from one side to the other, he says, is to cross "a cultural divide". "One passes from one world to another which is totally different." — AFP

ISLAMIST CANDIDATE IN EGYPT **ELECTIONS SHOT DEAD IN SINAI**

CAIRO: Gunmen shot dead an Islamist candidate in Egypt's parliamentary elections in North Sinai yesterday, officials said, where jihadists are waging an insurgency against the government. Mostafa Abdel Rahman, a candidate for ultraconservative Salafist Al-Nour party which is seen as pro-government, was gunned down by two assailants on a motorbike outside his home in the town of El-Arish, police officials said. Nour Party secretary general Galal Al-Murra confirmed his death to AFP.

Nour was the only prominent Islamist party to emerge unscathed from a crackdown on Islamists following the military overthrow of Islamist president Mohamed Morsi in 2013, having supported his ouster by then army chief Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi. With Morsi's Muslim Brotherhood blacklisted, and thousands of its activists killed or detained, the Nour party remained as the main Islamist grouping contesting the parliamentary elections that began on Oct 18.

Sisi, who is now president, is contending with a fierce insurgency in the Sinai Peninsula by Islamic State group affiliated militants who have branded his government as apostate, and elections as a heretical practice. Police officials say they believe jihadists targeted the candidate to undermine the elections. Abdel Rahman, who also acted as the North Sinai secretary general for the party, would be the first politician killed by militants in the two-year insurgency since Morsi's overthrow.

Jihadists have focused most of their attacks on the military, police and judiciary. Yesterday, the Islamic State group claimed credit for two roadside bombings in El-Arish over the past 48 hours that killed four policemen. It also said it had planted a bomb at a Cairo intersection flanked by hotels near the pyramids, which wounded four people when police tried to defuse it on Friday.

Attacks Follow Army Op

The attacks came despite a massive army operation to quell the insurgency in the peninsula bordering Israel and the Gaza Strip, and which the army claimed in September had killed scores of jihadists. Hundreds of policemen and soldiers had been killed in attacks since Morsi's overthrow, which unleashed a deadly crackdown on his supporters in which hundreds of protesters have been killed. Egypt had tightened security for the multi-stage election, which runs from Oct 18 to Dec 2.

The election was part of a promised transition to democracy by Sisi after he overthrew Morsi, the country's first freely elected leader whose divisive year in power prompted massive rallies demanding his resignation. The poll comes following a constitutional referendum and the 2014 presidential elections that Sisi won. Turnout in the first round on Oct 18 was relatively low, with only 26.6 percent of registered voters casting ballots, according to an electoral commission official. That was a sharp drop from the 62 percent registered in the first stage of the last parliamentary poll, held in 2011 months after the ouster of longtime president Hosni Mubarak. Morsi's Muslim Brotherhood won most seats, followed by the Nour party, creating an Islamist-dominated parliament eventually disbanded by a court order in 2012. — AFP

SUPER STORM WEAKENS AS IT SOAKS MEXICO

PUERTO VALLARTA, MEXICO: Hurricane Patricia, one of the strongest storms ever recorded, crashed into western Mexico with rain and winds of up to 266 kph, hammering coastal areas but causing less damage than had been feared as it skirted cities and major tourist resorts. Mowing down trees, flooding streets and battering buildings, Patricia plowed into Mexico as a Category 5 hurricane on Friday evening before grinding inland. It rapidly lost power in the mountains that rise up along the Pacific coast and was downgraded to a tropical depression yesterday morning as it headed through central Mexico.

Thousands of residents and tourists along the coast had fled the storm's advance and ended up in improvised shelters. But there were no early reports of deaths and many felt they had escaped lightly. It appeared major damage was averted because the powerful storm did not hit large population centers. Patricia's edges brushed the major port of Manzanillo. Port director Jorge Bustos said the facility was still closed, but he expected it to be open again by yesterday afternoon. "We didn't have any major damage," he said. "Sure, gates, doors, some windows, volatile or light roofs, that sort of thing, but nothing that was a risk to our operations."

Further north, around 15,000 tourists had been hastily evacuated from the busy beach resort of Puerto Vallarta. But many were able to leave shelters and return to their hotels on Friday night. "I don't think there's going to be a big problem with the water," said Dario Pomina, 43, manager of the Posadas de Roger hotel in the center of Puerto Vallarta. "Things are more or less okay." The city woke to light rain yesterday and workers removed boards from windows. Public buses were up and running.

But residents of Las Juntas, a village where the Ameca and Mascota rivers meet about 10 km from Puerto Vallarta, were being evacuated yesterday after a rapid rise in water levels overnight caused flooding, emergency services spokeswoman Veronica Diaz said. Patricia's center hit land on Friday evening near the area of

Cuixmala, located between Manzanillo and Puerto Vallarta and home to one of Mexico's most exclusive getaways, the US National Hurricane Center said.

The resort at Cuixmala was founded by Anglo-French financier Sir James Goldsmith and has played host over the years to a colorful assortment of world leaders, musicians and eccentric billionaires. Maria Pavon, a Cuixmala reservations booker based in the inland city of Colima, said there were no guests staying when

the storm hit as they all been evacuated. But there was no word yet on the state of the resort. She and colleagues had been unable to make contact as phone lines were down, Pavon said.

The area around Cuixmala is sparsely populated, but there are small towns, and it was not clear yet how much damage they had suffered. At one point generating sustained winds of up to 322 kph, Patricia was the strongest hurricane ever recorded in the Western Hemisphere. Even though it lost some power before coming

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ashore, it was still a Category 5 storm, the strongest on the five-step Saffir-Simpson scale. Such storms are relatively rare and are capable of causing devastating destruction. Patricia's ferocious core was relatively small, with hurricane force winds extending 55 km from the center, the Hurricane Center said. This meant Puerto Vallarta and Manzanillo were spared the

In Puerto Vallarta, Brian Shelley, a tourist from Chicago, rode out the storm eating burg-

ers with other guests at a boutique hotel on a hill. After talking one of his panicked traveling companions into staying, he was glad Patricia turned out to be less punishing than was feared. "I've seen bigger waves on normal days," he joked. In Manzanillo, Ramona Delgado, 45, who manages an apartment block, spent the night in darkness at home with her two children, but said yesterday morning the lights were back on. "It scared us a lot, we thought Manzanillo was going to disappear," she said. "There are only fallen trees on our block."

Rapidly Loses Power

Once inland, Patricia rapidly lost power. By mid-morning yesterday morning it had been downgraded to a tropical depression with its maximum winds down to about 55 kph, the Miami-based Hurricane Center said. The storm was located about 155 km northeast of the central city of Zacatecas, heading rapidly northeast at 39 kph, the center said. However, Patricia could still pose a flood threat. It was expected to produce total rainfall accumulations of 20 to 30 cm, with isolated maximum amounts of 50 cm, over the Mexican states of Nayarit, Jalisco, Colima, Michoacan, and Guerrero through yesterday, the center said.

In a brief televised address on Friday, President Enrique Pena Nieto said that "initial reports confirm that damage has been less than would be expected of a hurricane of this magnitude." But he urged Mexicans not to lower their guard yet. The government cautioned that ash and other material from the volcano of Colima, some 210 km from Puerto Vallarta, could combine with heavy rainfall to trigger liquid cement-style mudflows.

Patricia became a tropical storm on Thursday and strengthened with stunning speed as it closed in on the Mexican coast. Meteorological authorities compared it to Typhoon Haiyan, which killed over 6,300 people in the Philippines in 2013. The strongest storm on record was Cyclone Tip which hit Japan in 1979. — Reuters

NEW YORK CITY COULD SET NEW TIPPING TREND

NEW YORK: The centuries-old tradition of tipping at New York restaurants predates the Statue of Liberty and seems woven into the fabric of a city that often sets social trends for the rest of the country. But now Restaurateur Danny Meyer, owner of tourist hotspot Shake Shack, upscale Union Square Cafe and The Modern, is tipping the tables on gratuities, saying he will eliminate them at 13 of his New York City restaurants and increase base wages for cooks and servers while raising base prices.

Gratuities generate tens of billions of dollars a year for servers, and the practice is not expected to disappear overnight. Some restaurants have already discontinued tipping while others ended discretionary tipping by including a base tip on the check. But tips on merit are still widespread. Experts said such a move by a man like Meyer is sure to start the industry rethinking a practice that is as much a given as cutlery on the table. "He's taking the first, very visible step in going in that direction," said Cydna Bougae, clinical assistant professor at New York University's Tisch Center for Hospitality and Tourism. Even so, she observed, "there's going to be a lot of wait and see with the industry."

Meyer has portrayed the new policy as part of a growing national movement to assure a minimum hourly wage of \$15 for workers at fast-food restaurants and other service businesses. The National Restaurant Association, a trade group that is opposed to the \$15-an-hour initiative, said restaurants should decide their own tip policy. "It's vital that restaurants continue to have the freedom to choose what works best for their business and their workforce to keep the industry thriving as a leading jobs creator for our country," the association said in a statement. "The notip model remains a limited concept with a handful of restaurants testing it nationwide. We have found the practice of tipping has traditionally attracted millions of employees to our industry and still has strong support from American diners."

Meyer, whose Union Square Hospitality Group has 1,800 employees, said last week he would implement the policy next month at The Modern, a high-end eatery near the Museum of Modern Art, and phase it in at other restaurants over the next year. Meyer said in a statement that he decided to do away with tips partly to attract and retain talented cooks and other kitchen staff who generally receive no tips. "For our teams, the change will be significant," Meyer said. "We will now have the ability to compensate all of our employees equitably, competitively, and professionally."

Meyer's restaurant group did not respond to interview requests. But in an interview with food critic Ryan Sutton for website Eater NY, Meyer said he plans on raising menu prices between 21 percent and 25 percent and distributing the extra revenue among kitchen staff and servers. Meyer said he expected workers who had been previously tipped to earn the same or more under the new policy.

Restaurant Opportunities Centers United (ROC), which lobbies for fast food restaurant workers to earn \$15 per hour, supports Meyer. "Eliminating the two-tiered wage system is essential to ensuring a fair and just future for the nation's 11 million restaurant workers," it said. Melissa Fleischut, president and chief executive of the New York State Restaurant Association, has said restaurant owners would closely watch Meyer's actions to decide their own. Whether hospitality industry leaders follow suit depends on how the policy affects Meyer's bottom line, if eliminating gratuities affects service, and how employees view the change, NYU's Bougae said.

As for restaurant workers, the sentiment is mixed. Cameron Holmes, a bar manager at Brooklyn's Bar LunAtico, said when he heard of the no-tips plan he initially thought service staff revenue would drop. But, he said, after looking closer at the model, which included shared revenue, it seemed fair, especially to cooks who are legally not allowed to share in gratuities. "As long as it's not just a redistribution and it's going to be a revenue share, it could be a tremendous thing for everyone," he said. — Reuters



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'ARSON ATTACK' GUTS PLANNED REFUGEE HOME IN SWEDEN

STOCKHOLM: A planned refugee home in Sweden was torched in a suspected arson attack, police said yesterday, the latest incident apparently targeting new arrivals in Europe's migrant crisis. Firefighters were called to the blaze in Eskilstuna, 90 kilometres (50 miles) west of Stockholm, around 11:00pm (2100 GMT) on

Friday, but the building was almost totally destroyed.

Police have launched an arson inquiry into the attack on the building, a former holiday camp which had been set to house around 60 people seeking asylum in Sweden. The incident adds to around a dozen similar attacks since the start of the year and came a day after a man armed with a sword killed two people in a racist attack at a Swedish school with many immigrant pupils.

"If it's because of the fact that some people think this type of lodging should not exist-then that's really terrible," local official Tryggve Lundh said of the migrant hostel fire on SR public radio. Sweden, a country of 9.8 million, expects to receive up to 190,000 asylum applications this year-putting it among the EU states with the highest proportion of refugees per capita as the continent struggles with a massive influx of migrants.

Support for the far-right has grown as Sweden's ability to house and inte-

grate the new arrivals comes under strain. Anti-immigration attitudes have been rising across Europe, as more than 600,000 migrants and refugees-most fleeing violence in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan-have made the dangerous journey to the continent this year, according to the

BALKAN COUNTRIES MAY CLOSE BORDERS IF GERMANY DOES

HUGE INFLOW OF MIGRANTS INTO SLOVENIA CONTINUES

SOFIA: Bulgaria, Serbia and Romania said vesterday they would close their borders if Germany or other countries do the same to stop refugees coming in, warning they would not allow the Balkan region to become a buffer zone for stranded migrants.

Bulgarian Prime Minister Boiko Borisov announced the decision after meeting his Serbian and Romanian counterparts in the capital Sofia ahead of a planned summit of European Union leaders today. It is an indication of the divisions that have opened up between of hundreds of thousands of migrants, many fleeing conflict in Syria, Iraq and Afghanistan. "The three countries, we are standing ready, if Germany and Austria close their borders, not to allow our countries to become buffer zones. We will be ready to close borders," Borisov told reporters.

"We will not expose our countries to the devastating pressure of millions that would come." Romanian Prime Minister Victor Ponta said this would be the three countries' common position at an extraordinary meeting of some European leaders on Sunday to tackle the migrant crisis in the western Balkans. Thousands trying to reach Germany are already trapped there in deteriorating conditions.

"We carry out our obligations, we are in solidarity with all of Europe," Ponta said. "But the responsibility cannot be put with just some countries. "If there are countries which close their borders, or build fences, then we have the right to defend ourselves in a timely manner."

Romania's neighbor Hungary has built a fence to keep out migrants and closed its border with Croatia, prompting Slovenia to consider following suit with its own fence.

European Commission chief Jean-Claude Juncker has invited to today's mini-summit the heads of state or government of Austria, Bulgaria, Croatia, Macedonia, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Romania, Serbia and Slovenia, plus key organizations involved. The aim of the meeting is to agree "common operanclusions which could be immediately imple mented".

It comes as crowds of refugees and other migrants camp by roads in western Balkan countries in worsening autumn weather after Hungary sealed its borders, causing a chain reaction in other overwhelmed states. "It is important for the people to know that it is not a problem to register (refugees), or build bigger centres, nothing of this is a problem for Serbia," Serbian Prime Minister Aleksandar Vucic told reporters.

Inflow continues

A huge inflow of migrants and refugees to Slovenia continued yesterday as thousands of people arrived to the tiny Alpine state on their way to Austria and Germany. Since last Saturday 58,000 migrants, many fleeing the war in Syria, have arrived in Slovenia, shifting their route to the west after Hungary sealed off its

As a percentage of Slovenia's tiny population that is the equivalent of almost 2.3 million people entering Germany or 1.8 million arriving in Britain in a week. Police said about 9,000 migrants were still in Slovenia yesterday with more on the way.

"We want to go to the Netherlands. I just want this ordeal to stop. There is no way back and I am ready to do anything to secure a future to my son," said 20-yearold Hamrein from Syria, holding her feverish 6-monthold son against her chest. She was one of about 2,000 migrants who were waiting in a muddy field near the Slovenian village of Rigonce to cross to nearby migrant mp, braving cold and foggy weather. Many put fires and wrapped themselves into blankets and aluminium foil to try to keep warm with morning temper-

atures being close to zero. They hope to be able to reach Austria later on Saturday but many more are behind them with about 8,500 migrants entering Serbia over the past 24 hour in order to continue their way to Croatia, Slovenia and then Austria. Serbia, Bulgaria and Romania said yesterday they would close their borders if Germany would do so, so as to prevent the Balkans becoming a buffer zone for stranded migrants.

Slovenia had said on Friday it would consider putting up a fence on its border with Croatia unless a solution is found at a today's meeting of regional heads of states with European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker. Croatia has so far insisted that walls or fences are not the solution, but rather a common EU approach tackling the situation on the border between Greece and Turkey, where most migrants and refugees enter the EU. — Agencies

'HOPELESSNESS' IN FRENCH SUBURBS A DECADE ON FROM RIOTS

shook France's suburbs, many residents say almost nothing in their lives has changed, and they feel excluded from the country's narrative and abandoned by politicians. President Francois Hollande paid a rare visit to one of the infamous "banlieues" this week-Courneuve, north of Paris-where he vowed that under the egalitarian principles of the French Republic, "no areas are left

But the whistles of disapproval that accompanied his speech underlined the disillusionment of locals, even though many of them voted for him in 2012.

"This could explode once again, because the social injustices are still there and there is a deep hopelessness among the young," warned Mehdi Bigaderne, the 32-year-old deputy mayor of Clichy-sous-Bois, the Paris suburb where the 2005 riots began and then spread to other parts of the country.

Bigaderne was a social worker in the area on October 27, 2005, when news broke that two teenagers had died while running away from the police. Bouna Traore, 15, and Zyed Benna, 17, were returning home from playing football and had done nothing wrong.

But accustomed to harassment, they chose to run when they saw a police car. They scaled a fence to hide in an electricity substation and were both electrocuted.

Protests over their deaths quickly turned violent. Police fought running battles against stone-throwing youths, cars were set alight and public buildings vandalized. "They had had enough of constantly being stopped by police, of the town being neglected," said Karim, who was 16 at the time and took part in the riots. "The death of Zyed and Bouna was the last

"It was a spontaneous social and urban revolt-a self-mutilation," said Bigaderne. The violence spread to neighboring estates such as Clichy, home to many poor firstand second-generation migrants-and then all over the country. The peak came on the night of November 6 when 274 areas were affected.

Three nights later, the government called a state of emergency. By the time calm was restored on November 17, 10,000 cars had been burned, 300 buildings destroyed or vandalized, two policemen

PARIS: Ten years on from the riots that shot and injured, and 6,000 people arrest-

'Apartheid'

Since then, successive governments have launched initiatives to tackle the deep-rooted challenges in these areas, often seen as "ghettos" that are all but cut off from the cities they surround. In Clichysous-Bois, some parts are unrecognisable: new and well-appointed apartment blocks have replaced the shabby towers that made life so easy for drug dealers and so difficult for the police.

An employment agency, health centre, police station and swimming pool have

But many see the changes as cosmetic. It can still take an hour and 40 minutes to reach Paris even though the capital lies just 15 kilometres (nine miles) away. Politicians took renewed interest after the jihadist attacks on Charlie Hebdo magazine and other Paris targets in January that left 17 dead raised fears that the suburbs were becoming breeding grounds for radical

Prime Minister Manuel Valls went as far as talking of "a territorial, social and ethnic apartheid".

One official report found unemployment was 23 percent in the suburbs, compared to nine percent countrywide, in 2013. Among people aged 15 to 24, the figure rose to 42 percent. Experts say the problems of the "banlieues" have deep roots, one of which is urban planning.

Many estates were thrown up in 1960s and 1970s to house waves of North African and sub-Saharan African workers who provided cheap labour for what was then a booming economy.

These concrete complexes typically lie outside the historic city centre. Transport links and shopping can be poor, reinforcing a sense of isolation and injustice. The 2008 financial crisis triggered "a considerable impoverishment of a large part of the population," said sociologist Didier Lapeyronnie. "We see a reinforcement of the social and racial segregation."

And the rise of the far-right National Front (FN) in recent years has only added to the tensions and the sense of separation. The situation, said Clichy mayor Olivier Klein, "is even more negative today than it was 10 years ago." — AFP

SCHOOL STABBING HIGHLIGHTS RACIAL TENSIONS IN SWEDEN

TROLLHATTAN, SWEDEN: The southern industrial city of Trollhattan has become a focal point for underlying racial tensions in Sweden, a country known for its generous attitudes to migrants. On Thursday, a 21-year-old

local man with racist motives rampaged through a school, stabbing two people to death and seriously wounding two others before being fatally shot by police. Authorities say he methodically selected dark-skinned

victims at Trollhattan's Kronan school,

The attacker, who killed a teacher and a student, has not been named by police. Many in this nation of 10 million were horrified by the violence but not

The Scandinavian nation of 10 million, known for its welcoming attitude toward migrants, was shocked by the violence in the southern industrial town near Sweden's second largest city, Goteborg.

'This is a black day for Sweden," Prime Minister Stefan Lofven said of the country's deadliest school attack. "It is a tragedy that hits the entire

Although violent crime is relatively rare in Sweden, there has been a spate of arson attacks on asylum centers in recent weeks as an influx of refugees has surged. Immigration officials estimate some 190,000 asylum-seekers will arrive this year, second only to Germany in Western Europe. — AP

ASSANGE: USE SNAIL MAIL TO THWART SPIES

BRUSSELS: WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange has urged journalists to use reqular postal services to thwart government spying.

"My recommendation, for people who don't have 10 years' experience in cryptography, is to return to old methods (and) use the traditional postal service," Assange said in an interview pub-

lished yesterday. "Journalists are treated by intelligence services as spies," he told the Belgian daily Le Soir. "The same methods used against spies are used against journalists, and now journalists must learn counterespionage methods to protect their

sources." On Thursday WikiLeaks released a second instalment of documents from CIA director John Brennan's hacked personal email account, including his contacts list. Assange, in another interview with the Belgian daily L'Echo, reiterated that WikiLeaks would release more of Brennan's documents on Monday, which he described as "documents awaited by many human rights activists and lawyers, but also people who were tortured."

He added that WikiLeaks would soon post information about the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP). In August, WikiLeaks offered 100,000 euros (\$110,000) for a copy of the trade

ONE KILLED IN IS-CLAIMED ATTACK ON DHAKA SHRINE

80 HURT AS BOMB HITS ASHOURA MOURNERS

DHAKA: The Islamic State group claimed responsibility for the bombing of the main Shiite shrine in the Bangladeshi capital yesterday that killed one person and wounded nearly 80, as thousands gathered for the annual Ashura procession. The rare attack on Bangladesh's tiny Shiite Muslim community comes just weeks after an Italian aid worker and a Japanese farmer were shot dead in attacks also claimed by the Islamic State (IS) jihadist groupalthough authorities reject the claims.

Officers said a 14-year-old boy died on the spot after three small bombs were thrown at the complex of the Hossaini Dalan, the main Shiite site in the old Mughal quarter of Dhaka, at about 2 am yesterday (2000 GMT Friday).

"There were some 20,000 people in and outside the building at that time. They were preparing to hold the annual Muharram mourning procession when the three (bombs) were exploded," deputy commissioner of Dhaka Police Mofiz Uddin Ahmed told AFP. The IS group later claimed the killing on Twitter, according to the SITE Intelligence Group, a US monitoring organization, but police said they had found no evidence to show the jihadists were behind the blasts. "So far we have not found any link to any militant group in the attack," Dhaka police spokesman Muntashirul Islam told AFP.

The attacks come as Shiites around the world mark the holy month of Moharram. Pakistan's Shiites have also suffered sectarian violence this week after

two suicide blasts killed at least 27 people. In Bangladesh, television showed live footage of the chaos in the aftermath of the blasts with fleeing people holding flags and ambulances taking the injured to hospital.

Police said around 80 people were injured in the attack on the 17th century religious site, at least one critically. The Rapid Action Battalion, the country's elite security force, said it believed the bombs used were improvised explosive devices (IEDs).

"We've recovered similar IEDs from the Islamist militants in the past," RAB deputy spokesman Major Magsudul Alam said.

Blast hit Ashura mourners

Authorities have yet to make any arrests in connection with the blasts but three people have been taken in for questioning, police inspector Mohammad Murad said. Home Affairs minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal told local media that authorities had video footage of the blasts and he hoped they could quickly track down the attackers.

Ashura marks the climax of the holy month of Muharram when Shiites hold processions and gatherings to mourn the martyrdom of the Prophet Mohammed's grandson Imam Hussain at the Battle of Karbala in Iraq in 680 AD. Witnesses told the mass-circulation daily Prothom Alo that many mourners fell to the ground as loud explosions went off at the main gate of the Hossaini Dalan, the most important prayer and congregation site for Bangladesh's Shiites.

Roni, who uses one name, said mourners dressed in black were holding prayers just before the procession when he heard 8-10 explosions and saw a fire. Security was stepped up at Shiite mosques across the country immediately after the attack and mourners in Dhaka's Mohammadpur neighborhood banned women and children from the procession.

Defying the attack, about 20,000 Shiites continued the procession in Dhaka, police and an AFP photographer at the scene said, cutting their bodies with knives and iron chains in a religious ritual. "We've been observing this mourning procession here for centuries. But we've never seen any incident like this. We demand a quick and fair investigation into the blasts," a leader of the Shiite community at Hossaini Dalan told reporters.

The explosions come as tensions run high in Bangladesh after the Islamic State group claimed its first attacks in the mainly moderate Sunni Muslimmajority country of 160 million people.

While the blasts are believed to be the first attack on Shiites in Bangladesh, in the past two years banned Islamist militant groups have killed more than a dozen Sufi Muslims and attacked Hindus and Christians. The killing of four atheist bloggers this year has also undermined government efforts to play down the threat posed by hardliners, experts

DEATH TOLL FROM PAKISTAN **BLAST RISES TO 24: MINISTER**

KARACHI: The death toll from a suspected suicide blast which targeted Shiite Muslims in the southern Pakistani city of Jacobabad has risen to 24, a provincial minister said

The officials had earlier confirmed that at least 16 people were killed and many more injured in the attack outside the residence of a local Shiite leader, which came as devotees were setting off towards a main procession in the city. Jam Mehtab Dahar, provincial minister for health in the southern province of Sindh where the attack took place, said more wounded people had succumbed to their injuries.

"The death toll has risen to 24 now," Dahar told AFP, adding that two of at least 20 wounded were still in a critical condition. Regional police chief Sain Rakhio Mirani told AFP that at least six of the victims were children. Mirani also said that

"initial evidence" suggested a suicide bomber was responsible for the blast. Pakistan is on high alert and has deployed some 10,000 troops and 6,000 paramilitary members to prevent sectarian violence during the mourning days of Ashura in the holy month of Moharram, a flashpoint in previous years.

Moharram, which began last week, sees Shiites hold processions and gatherings to mourn the martyrdom of the Prophet Mohammed's grandson Imam Hussain at the Battle of Karbala in Iraq in 680 AD. Hussain is equally revered by Sunnis, but hardliners oppose the public mourning of his martyrdom.

Sectarian violence-in particular by Sunni hardliners against the Shiites that make up roughly 20 percent of Pakistan's 200 million people-has claimed thousands of lives in the country over the past decade. —AFP

TALEBAN FIGHTERS MAROONED

KABUL: Dozens of Taleban fighters were stranded on a river island on the border between Afghanistan and Turkmenistan yesterday after fleeing army troops led by the Afghan vice president, the government said, though the Taliban denied

they were stuck. Taliban fighters fled on Thursday to the banks of the Amu River, one of the longest in Central Asia, deserting motorbikes and using fishing boats to reach the island, said Sultan Faizy, spokesman for Vice President General Abdul Rashid Dostum. "They have no choice but to surrender or starve," he said, adding that Afghan troops had not advanced so as not to

A Taliban spokesman denied its fighters were marooned, saying they were basing themselves on the Afghan side of the island to stage their fight against government forces. Afghanistan's vice president has been leading about 2,000 Afghan troops in the northern province of Jawzjan against the insurgents making a broad push across the north of the country. The clashes come just weeks after the Taliban briefly took control of provincial capital of Kunduz province in the movement's biggest victory in the 14-year war.

three weeks, seizing militants' heavy arms and vehicles and forcing the fighters to retreat to the island, Faizy said. The Jawzjan operation is part of the expanding fight by Afghan troops against the Taleban, which has launched sustained attacks on district and provincial centres since the withdrawal of most foreign troops at the end of last year.

Many districts across the country are now fully or partially under Taleban control in the fluid power struggle between the militants and government forces that can change daily. It was not the only attack on government officials during the week. On Thursday, Mohammad Daud Gulistani, the head of Jaghatu district in the embattled central province of Ghazni, was ambushed by armed gunmen and killed, according to the province's deputy governor. 

INDIA PAVES WAY FOR **WOMEN IN ARMY COMBAT ROLES**

NEW DELHI: The Indian government gave its nod yesterday for women to fly fighter jets, paving the way for them to assume combat roles for the first time in one of the world's largest militaries. The federal defense ministry gave the green light to a proposal for recruiting female fighter pilots in the Indian Air Force (IAF), where women already fly transport aircraft and helicopters. "With this decision to open up induction of women in the fighter stream, women have become eligible for induction in all branches and streams of the IAF," a defense ministry statement published yesterday said. "This progressive step is in keeping with the aspirations of Indian women and is in line with contemporary trends in Armed Forces of developed nations," it said, adding that after training, selected women "would enter a fighter cockpit by June 2017".

But India has kept them out of such roles, reportedly fearing women would be more vulnerable to sexual attacks, and worries over lodging and physical fitness. Air Chief Marshal Arup Raha expressed his reluctance to change tack last year when he said "women are by nature not physically suited for flying fighters for long hours". Since then, increasing numbers of female officers have brought court cases demanding better work conditions and permanent commissions instead of temporary terms of five to ten years. The ministry said it had carried out a review in connection with how to increase roles of women in the forces. "Once finalized more and more branches would be opened up for induction of women to give them the space which they deserve in the Armed Forces of the country," it said. Women form some five percent of around 1.32 million active personnel and 2.14 million reservists in the defense forces, according to government figures. —AFP





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SECOND ROUND OF REUNIONS FOR KOREAN FAMILIES

SEOUL: A second round of highly-charged family reunions brought together relatives split for six decades by the Korean War yesterday, with around 250 mostly elderly South Koreans crossing into the North. After passing the heavily militarized border in a convoy of buses, the group of South Korean families were driven to the North Korean resort of Mount Kumgang for the first day of emotional encounters with sons, daughters and siblings divided by the conflict.

Among them was Jung Gun-Mok, 64, who was abducted by the North in 1972 aboard a South Korean fishing boat in the Yellow Sea, and his mother, who last saw him as a young man.

"Your son is alive. Don't cry, mother," Jung said, hugging 88-year-old Lee Bok-Soon while wiping away her tears with a handkerchief, according to reports. Jung was among 500 South Koreans kidnapped by North Korea after the 1950-53 Korean War. Koo

Sang-Yeon, 98, was the eldest South Korean present, and met his two North Korean daughters. As a former North Korean soldier, he was captured during the war and released later from a prison camp to live in the South.

Fortunate minority

The meetings came two days after hundreds of other families wrapped up the first round of reunions. This week's events are only the second set of such encounters in the past five years-the result of an agreement the two Koreas reached in August to ease tensions that had pushed them to the brink of armed conflict. But interaction was tightly controlled-limited to six, two-hour sessions, including meetings in a communal hall, with more limited private one-on-one time without TV cameras.

For the families, the 12 hours total together was heartbreakingly short. But given there are more than 65,000 South Koreans currently on the waiting list for a reunion spot, those selected represent a very fortunate minority. Millions of people were displaced by the sweep of the Korean conflict, which separated brothers and sisters, parents and children, husbands and wives. Because the conflict ended with an armistice rather than a peace treaty, the two Koreas technically remain at war and direct exchanges of letters or telephone calls are

vast majority died without ever having any contact with their relatives in the North-and, in many cases, without knowing if they were even alive. With the mortality rate of reunion candidates increasing with every passing year, many accept they may never be selected and have resorted instead to taping video messages-and providing DNA samples-that might allow for some posthumous contact in the future.

The reunion program began in earnest after a historic North-South summit in 2000, and was initially an annual event. But

Pyongyang has long manipulated the reunion issue as a tool for extracting concessions from Seoul, and sees its agreement to hold the meetings as an act of diplomatic largesse that merits reward.

South Korea's presidential security advisor Kim Kwan-Jin said Thursday that Seoul would push for fresh talks with Pyongyang on arranging family reunions regularly.

US PATROLS IN SOUTH CHINA SEA COULD RAISE STAKES WITH BEIJING

HONG KONG: US plans to send warships or military aircraft within 12 nautical miles of China's artificial islands in the disputed South China Sea, possibly within days, could open a tense new front in Sino-US rivalry. A range of security experts said Washington's so-called freedom of navigation patrols would have to be regular to be effective, given Chinese ambitions to project power deep into maritime Southeast Asia and beyond.

But China would likely resist attempts to make such US actions routine, some said, raising the political and military stakes. China's navy could for example try to block or attempt to surround US vessels, they said, risking an escalation. Given months of debate already in Washington over the first such patrol close to the Chinese outposts since 2012, several regional security experts and former naval officers said the US government might be

reluctant to do them often. US allies such as Japan and Australia are unlikely to follow with their own direct challenges to China, despite their concerns over freedom of navigation along vital trade routes, they added. "This cannot be a one-off," said lan Storey, a South China Sea expert at Singapore's Institute of Southeast Asian Studies. "The US navy will have to conduct these kinds of patrols on a regular

basis to reinforce their message." The Obama administration has said the area after months of pressure from Congress and the US military. It has not given a timeframe. "I think we have been very clear - that we intend to do this," State Department spokesman Mark Toner told reporters last Monday.

Chinese Foreign Ministry officials said this month that Beijing would "never allow any country to violate China's territorial waters and airspace in the Spratly islands in the name of protecting navigation and overflight". Under the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea, 12-nautical mile limits cannot be set around man-made islands built on previously submerged reefs.

Four of the seven reefs China has reclaimed over the last two years were completely submerged at high tide before construction began, legal schol-

He said US thinking was illustrated by President Barack Obama's statement at a news conference with Chinese President Xi Jinping in Washington last month that "the United States will continue to sail, fly and operate anywhere that international law allows". Despite Xi's comment at the news conference that the man-made islands would not be militarised, some mainland Chinese analysts believe the reclamations will form the heart of a new military screen protecting Chinese submarines on southern Hainan Island, as well as boasting extensive civilian facilities.

These submarines will soon carry nuclear weapons and represent the core of China's nuclear deterrence, giving it a second strike capability.

"DANGEROUS ESCALATION" While China's outposts are seen as vulnerable in a conflict, up until that point they will allow Beijing to extend both civilian activities, such as fishing and oil exploration, as well as military patrols. One airstrip is fin-

China had never formally declared a 12-mile territorial zone around the reclamations, so any US show of force was premature, he

"Britain is sadly lending legitimacy to a regime with no rule of law, no freedom of speech, and with geopolitical ambitions that threaten the security of its neighboring nations - and perhaps the world," the statement said.

"Trade takes priority over basic human rights, and exiled protesters with legitimate grievances with the Beijing government are now no longer safe even the democracies that gave them refuge," it said, describing Britain's actions as "shameful."

Wang and Kaixi were top student leaders of the 1989 pro-democracy movement centered on Beijing's Tiananmen Square that was brutally suppressed by China's army. Like Shao, also a veteran of the movement, they now live in exile. Speaking to Britain's The Independent newspaper, Shao said he was surprised by the extent of the actions taken by police, but hoped his arrest would raise awareness of human rights in China. 'I was protesting peacefully," the Independent quoted him as saying. "And when I was arrested I couldn't believe that this country was no longer protecting freedom of expression. It's just like China now.

Xi's state visit sparked a series of protests over China's human rights record and other issues.

London's Metropolitan Police confirmed that three people were arrested "to prevent a breach of the peace" and on suspicion of conspiracy to commit threatening behavior. They were later released on bail and have not been charged. Lucy D'Orsi, commander of the police operation for the state visit, said in a statement that police had worked "tirelessly" to facilitate peaceful protests, but that tight security was needed to ensure the safety of Xi and his wife, as well as the British royal family and prime minister.

"The assertion that political manipulation of the command team or, indeed, the broader Metropolitan Police took place is wrong and doesn't reflect the facts," D'Orsi said.

Xi, who also heads China's Communist Party, which brooks no opposition, returned to China on Friday after a carefully orchestrated visit that included a stay at Buckingham Palace and an address to Parliament. Organized crowds waving Chinese flags greeted Xi throughout, outnumbering pro-Tibet and human rights protesters concerned about the lavish welcome accorded to Xi. The two countries signed more than \$46 billion in economic agreements during the trip. — AP

SUU KYI URGES ACTION ON ILLEGAL USE OF RELIGION IN ELECTION CAMPAIGN

KAWHMU, MYANMAR: Myanmar opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi yesterday urged the government to take action against people using religion to stir tensions as campaigning intensifies for landmark polls next month. The former junta-ruled nation has seen sporadic outbursts of deadly unrest in recent years, largely targeting minority Muslims who face increasing political exclusion as the influence of Buddhist nationalist monks grows.

Campaigning in her rural constituency of Kawhmu yesterday, Suu Kyi addressed the thorny issue of minority rights when a Muslim villager expressed a wish for equality if the National League for Democracy (NLD) sweeps to power as is widely tipped. "As our party respects the rule of law, I can say that we will treat all equally," Suu Kyi said after her speech to some 1,000 party supporters gathered in the village of Upper Wartheinkha.

The Nobel laureate repeated recent claims that her political opponents were using religion in the Buddhist-majority nation to divide people ahead of the November 8 polls. But this time she went a step further by questioning why the army-backed ruling Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP) was not enforcing the law banning the use of religion in political campaigns.

"The government needs to safeguard the law for people to be able to live peacefully. We have to question the ruling authorities on why they're not taking proper action," she said. In March it also revoked temporary identity documents, stripping hundreds of thousands of minority Rohingya Muslims in the western state of Rakhine of voting rights. On its campaign trail in recent weeks the USDP has urged voters to pick it as the party which safeguards religious rights, at a time when radical monks are preaching the message that

Muslims threaten the social fabric of Myanmar. Suu Kyi herself has faced accusations of bowing to religious hardliners. Her party has fielded no Muslim candidates for the polls-part of a wider loss of political representation for a minority that makes

INDONESIA'S ACEH PROVINCE **ENACTS ISLAMIC CRIMINAL CODE**

BANDA ACEH, INDONESIA: Indonesia's

conservative Aceh province has enacted a strict Islamic criminal code, local government officials said late on Friday, criminalizing adultery, homosexuality, and public displays of affection outside

of a legally recognized relationship. Aceh is the only province in the Muslim-dominated country to adhere to sharia, Islamic law, which puts it at odds with other provinces where the vast majority of the population practices a moderate form of the religion. "Non-Muslims can choose whether to be tried under sharia law or the regular Indonesian criminal code," said Syahrizal Abbas, head of the sharia legal department in the provincial government.

The new law also criminalizes rape and sexual harassment. Those found guilty could face 40 lashes or more, according to a copy of the legislation seen by Reuters.

Rights groups warned the new law could criminalize consensual sex and create hurdles to reporting rape. "To punish anyone who has had consensual sex with up to 100 lashes is despicable," Josef Benedict, Amnesty International's South East Asia campaigns Director, said in a statement.

THAI POLICE ARREST 4 JAPANESE MEN OVER DRUGS, BRIBERY

BANGKOK: Four Japanese men have been charged over drug trafficking and bribery in Bangkok after they were busted in an undercover operation, Thai police said yesterday. The four accused, aged between 34 and 50, were arrested on Friday after a tip-off that one of the group was smuggling drugs out of Thailand. "Our undercover agent bought 2.3 kilos (5 lbs) of ice" from one of the Japanese nationals in central Bangkok, said a police statement yesterday, adding that the man was arrested and charged with

He was also charged with bribery for offering

police 1.7 million baht (\$48,000) for his release, it added. Another three Japanese nationals were also later charged with bribery for offering police some \$28,000 to release the original arrested man, the

Thailand is a known gateway to the lucrative Southeast Asian drugs market. Seizures of "ice", a form of methamphetamine, have quadrupled across the Asia-Pacific region over five years, the United Nations said in May. Much of the increase is down to an explosion in production of the usually less pure meth tablets, known in parts of Asia as "yaba". — AFP

Outlining the series of understandings, Kerry said:

Israel "fully respects" Jordan's "special role" as custodian of the site.
 Israel will continue to enforce its policy of religious worship, including "the fundamental fact" that it is Muslims who pray there and non-Muslims who visit. Israel has no intention of dividing the site and rejects any attempt to suggest otherwise.

• Israel welcomes increased coordination between Israeli authorities and Jordan to ensure that visitors and worshippers "demonstrate respect and restraint".

Noting the video monitoring, Kerry said it would provide "comprehensive visibility and transparency, and that could really be a game-changer in discouraging anybody from disturbing the sanctity of this holy site". On Friday, Israel lifted restrictions on Muslim worshippers after having barred younger Muslim menseen by police as the main potential troublemakers - from entering the compound on Fridays, the main day of prayer in the

Muslim religious week.

The bans had, at times, targeted men up to the age of 50 and fueled Palestinian fears that Israel was trying to change long-standing understandings under which Jews are allowed to visit, but not pray, at the shrine. Those fears have also been fueled by a rise in visits to the shrine by Jewish activists demanding prayer

rights, including senior members of Netanyahu's coalition government. Israel has repeatedly denied Palestinian allegations that it is trying to change the status quo and accused Palestinian political and religious leaders of lying and inciting to violence.

In the meetings with Abdullah, Abbas and Jordanian Foreign Minister Nasser Judeh, and earlier with Netanyahu, Kerry explored ways to address the violence that began in mid-September initially at the shrine, but has spread to the rest of Jerusalem, as well as the West Bank and Gaza strip. In the past five weeks, 10 Israelis have been killed in Palestinian attacks, mostly stabbings, while 49 Palestinians have been killed by Israeli fire, including 28 said by Israel to be attackers and the rest in clashes. Yesterday, Israeli forces shot a knife-wielding Palestinian dead after he ran toward a crossing between Israel and the West Bank and tried to stab security personnel, the Israeli military said.

Describing what he has heard in the talks with the leaders, Kerry said that "all of them expressed their strong commitment to ending the violence and restoring the calm as soon as possible". He said the US "strongly condemns terrorist attacks against innocent civilians. There is absolutely no justification for these reprehensible attacks". He added: "It is important to stop the back and forth of language that gives anybody an excuse to somehow be misinterpreted or misguided into believing that violence is a viable option." — Agencies

IN RACE FOR WHITE HOUSE, GUNS NO LONGER A TABOO

n the race for the White House, the hot button issue of guns is no longer a taboo, despite its potential to backfire at the ballot box. President Barack Obama - in his initial 2008 presidential campaign, and again during his bid for re-election in 2012 - shied away from the explosive subject fearing a backlash from voters bent on safeguarding their means of self-defense. But since then, much innocent blood has been spilled. Obama is now openly calling for America to change its stance on gun control. And the first debate featuring Democratic presidential hopefuls that took place in Las Vegas last week unexpectedly turned to the topic.

"I was very gratified to see all the candidates at the Democratic debate address guns and gun violence in America because heretofore that's the subject no one wants to bring up and that night it was at the forefront," Andy Parker, whose 24-year-old daughter, a reporter, was shot dead during a live television broadcast in August, told AFP. "There is going to be a clear choice in the presidential election. That's a referendum on guns," added Parker, who in a matter of weeks has become one of the most highprofile advocates for gun control in the United States.

Recent shootings have also pushed candidates to position themselves. Earlier this month, following a summer that saw a rise in homicides in major US cities, a community college in Oregon was the scene of a gun-related rampage that left nine dead. The perpetrator, a 26-year-old male, committed suicide.

Clinton at the Forefront

Democratic frontrunner Hillary Clinton has unveiled a plan to tighten the nation's gun laws, the cornerstone of which is to expand the background check system for weapons purchases to keep arms from getting into the wrong hands. "It's time the entire country stood up against the NRA," the powerful gun lobby, she told the nearly 16 million watching the televised Las Vegas debate.

The National Rifle Association, reputed to have many members of Congress in its pocket, paints every arms control proposition as an attack against the Second Amendment of the US Constitution. By positioning herself as a leader on gun control in the camp of Democratic presidential hopefuls, Clinton hopes to widen her lead over her main rival, US Senator Bernie Sanders. Sanders seems uncomfortable with the subject and has in the past defended gun lobby positions.


Representing the state of Vermont that is home to a numerous hunters, Sanders has in recent days been taken to task by Democrats for his support of pro-gun ownership views - a stance traditionally seen as being more in line with Republican thinking. But the injection of guns into the campaign has been well received by many in the GOP, convinced their opponents will get burned.

Trump Feels Better Armed

The Republican frontrunner Donald Trump, for one, recently said he feels "much better being armed". Taking up an old, pro-gun lobbying strategy that has proven successful, he suggested that the Obama administration was planning to confiscate guns from US homes, something the president has never put forward. Still, some experts agree that, over time, traditional supporters of the NRA - older whites who live in rural areas and are relatively uneducated - will decline.

On the opposite end of the spectrum, there's a growing part of the population that is largely reticent when it comes to the possession of weapons Asians and predominantly Hispanics, who make up 17 percent of the population at the moment. "With continued high-profile incidents of mass shootings in the US... and with the increasing diversity of the American voter (more immigrants, more minorities, few whites from a European background), Democrat candidates are feeling more confident to returning to a traditional issue they have supported since the 1960s - gun control," said Gregg Carter, a professor at Bryant University in Rhode Island. —AFP

STRANGLING JERUSALEM

Palestinian lands, but it is Jerusalem that has been the epicenter of the violence. This tragedy has been compounded by the fact that most US analysts and political leaders have been dead wrong in their simplistic, myopic, or, at times, even bigoted assessments of what is happening and why.

For example, The Atlantic's Jeffery Goldberg says the violence has been caused by Palestinian "paranoia" and their refusal to acknowledge "the national and religious rights" of Jews. Bret Stephens, writing in the Wall Street Journal, accuses the Palestinians of "blood lust". For their part, Members of Congress have been jumping all over each other to see who can issue the harshest denunciations of the Palestinian Authority for incitement and/or not doing enough to control the situation.

In reality, the roots of the violence in Jerusalem are deeper and far more complex. For decades now, Israel has been strangling East Jerusalem denying its Palestinian inhabitants freedom, opportunity, dignity, and hope, with devastating impact. Before Israel closed Jerusalem off from the rest of the West Bank in 1994, the city had served as the hub of Palestinian life. Not only was the city important for its religious role, all of the major Palestinian economic, social, cultural, educational, medical, and service institutions were located in the city.

Jerusalem was Palestine's heart, and the flow of people in and out was its lifeblood. Jerusalem's people and its businesses and institutions were sustained by Palestinians from the West Bank who entered daily to work or shop, to visit or take advantage of the services it provided. And Palestinians from the rest of the West Bank were, in turn, nourished by all that the city had to offer. The choking impact of the closure was felt almost immediately. It became so difficult and humiliating to pass through checkpoints to get into Jerusalem, that people stopped making the effort. This was compounded by Israeli orders requiring Palestinian institutions to leave the city and

reopen in Ramallah.
Israel didn't stop with closure. They also intensified the hardships faced by the Arab population of the city. Palestinian residents who couldn't find work in Jerusalem were forced to look elsewhere for employment. But when Israelis discovered that an Arab was not permanently residing in the city, they revoked his or her residency - denying

their right to return to Jerusalem. 14,000 such revocation orders have been issued.

In the past several decades, Israel has also confiscated one third of Palestinian-owned land in and around Jerusalem to build Jewish-only colonies and a network of highways connecting them to Israel. These colonies now house over 200,000 Jewish settlers. At the same time, Israeli authorities in Jerusalem have routinely denied building permits to Palestinians thus forcing them to build, without permission, new housing for their growing population. The Israelis have, at will, issued demolition orders against these "illegal" homes. Thousands of such orders have been issued, and in the past decade alone more than 2,000 Palestinians in Jerusalem have been rendered homeless by demolitions.

Further compounding this state of affairs has been the effort by ultra-nationalist Israeli groups, supported by American Jewish "charities", to seize homes and properties in the heart of older Arab neighborhoods in Jerusalem and the Old City and to populate them with extremist settlers. These seizures often occur in the dark of night under the protection of the Israeli military. In recent years 119 of these provocative "projects" have been settled by almost 2,000 hardliners. Because they are in the heart of Arab neighborhoods and are guarded by Israel forces, they result in nightmarish disruptions to daily life.

Impact

The impact this has had on East Jerusalem's Palestinian population can been seen in ways both physical and spiritual. Arab Jerusalemites have become impoverished, with three-quarters of them living below the poverty line. Unemployment is in the 40 percent range, with most of Palestinians from East Jerusalem only able to find menial jobs in West Jerusalem. Educated young Palestinians are given a stark choice - either accept employment as a waiter or a taxi driver or give up residency in Jerusalem to find a job in their field outside of

This has taken a profound toll on the soul of Arab Jerusalemites, young and old. Denied dignity and hope, both despair and anger have set in. While some older Palestinians in the city have become cynical and resigned, younger Palestinians have become angry, seeking revenge. They are resentful of and feel humiliated by the settlers who have moved into their neighborhoods, closing off streets and moving about with a sense of entitlement. While Palestinian attacks on Israelis are reported in great detail, the attacks on

Palestinians by settlers (140 in October, alone) have largely

been ignored.

Young Palestinians see their parents in despair and know that their futures are, at best, devoid of promise for a better life. All of this has set the stage for the epidemic of violence that has now unfolded in Jerusalem. To be sure, the provocative invasions of the Haram Al-Sharif by hardline Israeli ministers and their extremist followers have aggravated the situation. But to identify the root cause of the violence as either Palestinian "incitement", "blood lust" or "paranoia" and to ignore the profoundly unsettling existential incitement faced by Palestinians is unconscionable.

Make no mistake, the stabbings cannot be justified and should be condemned. They accomplish nothing other than to take lives or cause bodily harm to others. But the Israeli response which has been to bring down even more harsh and repressive measures on an already much violated captive people is no solution. And neither are the lame appeals to "restore calm". More repression will not cure an ailment that has been caused by too much oppression. And "restoring calm" is embarrassingly hollow since it promises nothing more than a return to the pre-existing state of affairs than spawned the violence, in the first place.

Tragedy

In many ways, the tragedy unfolding in Jerusalem reminds Palestinians of what has occurred in Hebron. First, settlements and checkpoints choked off Hebron from its surroundings. Then heavily guarded compounds of fanatics entered the heart of the city, shutting down the main street killing its commerce. The final blow came after an extremist settler massacred 29 Muslims at prayer in Hebron's mosque. The Israeli response was to divide the mosque into Jewish and Muslim sides. While Jews were able to enter freely, Muslims were forced to endure humiliating security before entering - with the mosque being declared closed to Muslims, whenever the Israelis decide.

Stephens, Goldberg, and company see only Israeli victims. They limit their focus to the stabbings and the rock throwing youth and blame them. But there is a deeper story and that is that these young Palestinians are also victims-of decades of oppression and the denial of hope. Until it is understood that these Palestinian lives matter and concrete steps are taken to provide them with freedom, opportunity, and hope, the tragedy will continue.

SOCIAL MEDIA IS SOURCE OF NEWS - AND ANGER

our dailies, eight TV stations, and scores of radio stations report on the current wave of Israeli-Palestinian violence in the Palestinian territories. But they are background noise for many Palestinian youth, whose No. 1 source of news comes from Facebook groups that pump out a minute-by-minute stream of bloody images and pro-violence slogans.

Many Palestinians say such sites only hold up a mirror, or camera, to incessant Israeli violence and pent-up Palestinian fury - that social media reflects reality, not creates it. But Israeli officials argue the medium is the message - that Palestinian social media news sites, some with millions of followers, and the content they post are the driving force in the current wave of violence.

"We are seeing a situation in which Osama Bin Laden meets (Facebook founder) Mark Zuckerberg," Israeli Prime Minister Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said this week. "The incitement on the social networks is what is causing the wave of terror." It was a message Netanyahu repeated in meetings this week with US Secretary of State John Kerry and other world leaders trying to find a way to calm the current tensions. The incitement, Israeli officials say, includes caricatures and video reenactments demonizing Israelis, graphics with instructions on "how to stab a Jew", and youth calling for martyrdom on Facebook before carrying out stabbings. Hashtag slogans label the violence an intifada, or uprising, and accuse Israel of endangering Islam's third-holiest spot - a claim that has fueled recent violence.

Occupation

Palestinians say such claims miss the point, and that the violence is the natural result of nearly 50 years of Israeli military occupation and, after years of failed peace efforts, the lack of hope for gaining independence anytime soon. They note that Israeli Facebook pages also post graphic images and hateful messages that contribute to the tense and sometimes vengeful atmosphere.

Leaders on both sides have also blamed each other for contributing to violence with their words. Netanyahu accused Palestinian

President Mahmoud Abbas of incitement when he made an erroneous claim that Israel had killed a Palestinian teen when he was actually being treated in an Israeli hospital. The same accusation has been leveled at Netanyahu for speeches linking Abbas to the Islamic State group and suggesting a World War II-era Palestinian leader was the one who persuaded Hitler to exterminate European Jews.

Israeli officials say they convinced Google's YouTube service and Facebook to remove some Palestinian videos, and an Israeli legal group is preparing a class-action lawsuit against Facebook to force the site to remove certain pro-Palestinian pages. Facebook in the past has removed some Palestinian news sites, but they simply popped up again under a different guise. Over time, they have become essential sources of news for Palestinians.

The Quds News Network, which operates one of the most prominent Palestinian Facebook news sites, has about 3.7 million Facebook followers and says it relies on a network of some 300 stringers throughout Israel, the West Bank and Gaza. It breaks news so rapidly that it tends to beat out traditional Palestinian media outlets - even providing those outlets with video and photos.

The site says it is independent, but has a reputation for being affiliated with Islamic Jihad, a Palestinian militant group. Another active Facebook site, run by the Shehab News Network, has about 4.2 million followers and is regarded by Palestinians as being linked with Hamas. Both militant groups oppose Israel's right to exist, and have killed scores of Israelis in suicide bombings and shootings over the years.

Message

"Our message is twofold. Number one is to support the resistance. Second, expose the aggressive acts of the Israeli occupation," said Ahmed Yousef, 25, an editor at Quds News Network. Sitting in a baklava shop on a recent afternoon, he coordinated coverage with other editors in a Facebook chat group on his cell phone. Yousef said his site does not encourage violence, but only reflects the attitude of the streets. "During this uprising we have to match the mood of the people," he said.

Ten Israelis have been killed over the last month, mainly in stabbing attacks. On the Palestinian side, 49 people have been killed by Israeli fire, 28 of them labeled by Israel as attackers, the others killed in clashes with Israeli forces. The violence has been fueled by rumors that Israel is plotting to take over a sensitive Jerusalem holy site revered by both Jews and Muslims. Israel says it is committed to a longstanding status quo, but Palestinians point to the growing number of religious Jewish visitors to the site, as well as calls from activist groups and senior politicians for expanded Jewish prayer rights.

Palestinians say the violence is also rooted in frustration at decades of living under Israeli occupation. Israel says the reason is much simpler: Palestinian leaders are inciting the unrest with incendiary accusations, and Facebook posts are fanning the flames. Israeli social media have also spread graphic images, including security camera footage of attacks released by police. One popular Israeli Facebook news site, 0404, has a following of about 370,000 and provides a constant feed of news and images, including photos of dead Palestinians after being shot by Israeli forces, though it blurs graphic images. It also praises Israeli soldiers as "our brothers" for thwarting

But the reach of these sites seems to pale in comparison to the Palestinian Facebook groups, whose audiences dwarf those of more traditional news sources. The Al-Ayyam daily, a major Palestinian newspaper, estimates its daily readership at about 120,000, while the top TV channel viewed by Palestinians, Al-Jazeera, is seen by about 22 percent of Palestinian adults, according to a survey last month by

pollster Khalil Shikaki.

In the first intifada, or uprising, in the 1980s, militant groups called for demonstrations by scrawling announcements on cement walls; today, those calls are made on Facebook walls. About half of Palestinians in the West Bank and Gaza use the Internet, and among young people, the percentages are much higher. Some 1.5 million Palestinians use Facebook. Electronic media, including Facebook and Twitter, are the No. 1 source of news for young Palestinians, said Ghassan Khatib of the Jerusalem Media and Communications Center, a research and polling center. —AP

seed powered through the first set in 26 minutes, his strong serving and hard accurate baseline strokes regularly wrongfooting 2009 winner Baghdatis. Looking sluggish after his hard-fought quarter-final win

over Gilles Simon on Friday, there was little to suggest that Baghdatis was capable of a comeback before he informed the umpire and his opponent that he was unable to continue. In today's decider, Berdych will meet American Jack

US TO HOST COPA AMERICA

MIAMI: The United States will host the centenary Copa America in 2016 despite the original deals for the competition featuring in the Department of Justice's (DOJ) indictments against soccer officials in the region. The decision paves the way for the biggest official international tournament in the U.S. since the 1994 World Cup and could see top players such as Argentine Lionel Messi and Brazilian Neymar in action at NFL stadiums.

Confirmation of the June 3-26 event was announced in a joint statement on Friday from CONCACAF, the soccer confederation for North and Central America and the Caribbean and CONMEBOL, the South American confederation.

A U.S. Soccer statement also said the tournament would go ahead in "venues across the United States". The move was made possible by the two confederations reclaiming the broadcast and sponsor rights for the competition from Datisa, a marketing firm that featured in the DOJ indictments.

Suspended CONCACAF president Jeffrey Webb, who had been a key player in creating the 2016 tournament, was arrested in May along with Eugenio Figueuredo and Nicolas Leoz, both ex-presidents of CONMEBOL. The three were among 14 soccer officials and sports marketing executives who were indicted for racketeering, conspiracy and corruption by the DOJ in May.—Reuters

MARINERS HIRE NEW COACH

NEW YORK: The Seattle Mariners named Scott Servais as their new manager on Friday with hopes the former Los Angeles Angels assistant general manager can end his new Major League Baseball team's lengthy playoff drought. Servais, a former catcher who spent 11 years in the major leagues with four different teams, replaces Lloyd McClendon, who was fired two weeks ago by Seattle ago after failing to make the postseason during his two years in charge.

"It has long been my goal to manage a big league team," Servais, who is the 17th full-time manager in Mariners history, said in a statement.

"We have a terrific core of players and I'm looking forward to bringing in a coaching staff that will help me establish a winning culture here as we work toward putting a championship-caliber team on the field for the fans of the Northwest." Prior to his stint in Los Angeles, where he worked on all aspects of baseball operations, Servais spent six seasons as the senior director of player development for the Texas Rangers. The 48-year-old was also a scout for the Colorado Rockies in 2005 after spending the prior two years as a roving catching instructor for the Chicago Cubs.—Reuters

Royals back in World Series

KANSAS CITY: The Kansas City Royals advanced to the World Series for a second straight year after some daring base-running helped them beat the Toronto Blue Jays 4-3 in Game Six of the American League Championship Series on Friday. Lorenzo Cain scored from first base on a single down the right field line by Eric Hosmer with no outs in the bottom of the eighth to snap a 3-3 tie and set up a 'Fall Classic' against National League champions the New York Mets.

The best-of-seven Major League Baseball championship series will begin on Tuesday in Kansas City. Royals shortstop Alcides Escobar was named most valuable player of the series after batting .478 (11-for-23), scoring six runs,

driving in five and playing sterling defense. While Cain made a mad dash around the Kauffman Stadium bases, Toronto outfielder Jose Bautista pirouetted after reaching the ball and fired toward second to keep Hosmer at first, not thinking Cain would try to race home on the play. Toronto threatened in the ninth with similar aggression on the basepaths as pinch-runner Dalton Pompey stole second and third with no one out and Kevin Pillar walked to put men on first and third with Royals closer Wade Davis on

"It got pretty bad there, pretty quick," said Davis, who came into the game at the top of the eighth and waited an hour to return to the mound for the ninth because of a rain delay. "I kept telling myself, 'We can get out of it, keep making pitches, just get this win for the team." Davis struck out pinch-hitter Dioner Navarro and Ben Revere before getting Josh Donaldson to ground out to third to secure a 4-2 series triumph with a nail-biting victory that unleashed wild celebrations on the diamond.

'FANTASTIC YEAR'

Kansas City had led 3-1, aided by a controversial home run for Mike Moustakas in the second inning, going into the top of the eighth when Bautista belted a two-run blast off reliever Ryan Madson to tie the game.

Bautista also supplied the first run of the game for Toronto with a towering home run in the fourth inning to halve a then 2-0 Kansas City lead. Rain forced a delay of some 40 minutes before the bottom of the eighth and Cain's dash to the plate for the winning margin.

Cain said he just kept on going after seeing third base coach Mike Jirschele windmilling his arm to send him home. "I'm struggling to get to third and I saw Jirschele signal me," said Cain. "Now we're going back to the World Series. Couldn't get any better than this."

Kansas City will be trying for their first World Series title in 30 years, while the Mets seek their first Fall Classic crown in 29 years after most recently losing to their cross-town rival Yankees in the Subway Series of 2000. "Last year at this time we were so excited to be here," said Royals manager Ned Yost. "This year, from the first day of spring training we expected to be here."

Blue Jays manager John Gibbons gave credit to Kansas City, the AL Central winners who earned top seeding with the league's best regular season record.

"I want to congratulate the Kansas City Royals for a wonderful year," said Gibbons. "They set the tone last year and they had a fantastic year this year. "They are going to be a heck of a representative for the American League, that's for sure."—Reuters

PATRIOTS FACE JETS WHILE LONDON CALLS BILLS, JAGUARS

NEW YORK: While the visiting New York Jets try to topple the unbeaten New England Patriots today, the Buffalo Bills and Jacksonville Jaguars meet in the NFL's latest London showcase matchup.

Week seven of the campaign also finds all three of the NFL's 6-0 teams-Cincinnati, Green Bay and Denver-enjoying a week off to recover from their sizzling starts while New England and Carolina, both 5-0, look to match them for the best record this season.

The Jets (4-1) bring the NFL's sternest defensive unit-surrendering only 15 points a game-to New England, where star quarterback Tom Brady guides the NFL's top scoring attack at more than 36 points a contest. "He's one of the best quarterbacks in the league," said Jets defensive end Leonard Williams. "It's going to be great to get my hands on him and mess him up a little bit."

Four-time Super Bowl champion Brady, who will set a Patriots record with his 212th career start, has guided the attack to an NFLbest 50.8 percent success rate on third-down conversions and knows how to deal with imposing defenders.

"They want to be aggressive. They don't want to be dictated to," Brady said. "They want to see if you can block them. It's a big challenge for us. They are very tough to beat."

The reigning Super Bowl champion Patriots

East division lead with the Jets.

"This is going to be another win for us," Jets defensive lineman Sheldon Reed said. "They have run this division for a while so I am kind of happy we get next. We are licking our chops." Jets cornerback Darelle Revis leads the NFL with six takeaways, three fumble recoveries and three interceptions. He helped the Patriots win the Super Bowl last February but New England did not pick up a \$20 million contract option for 2015 and in March, Revis joined the Jets in a five-year deal worth \$70

"It's going to be a battle," Revis said. "The Patriots have been playing lights-out on offense and we've been playing lights-out on defense. It should be very exciting." Brady is excited, having seen Revis in every practice last season on the path to a championship.

"He has been an incredible playmaker. He covers the top guys every week," Brady said. "I got a firsthand look at that last year every day in practice and it was great to have him play a part here, but he moved on, so now he's our competition again."

At London, the Jaguars share the NFL's worst record at 1-5 and will try to snap a fourgame losing streak against injury-hit Buffalo (3-3), which lurks just outside the playoff positions in the American Conference as mid-sea-

want to avoid falling into the tie for the AFC son looms. The Bills are without quarterback Tyrod Taylor due to a knee injury and top receivers Percy Harvin and Sammy Watkins with hip and ankle injuries respectively. That will put more pressure on reserve passer E.J. Manuel, making just his 16th NFL start, and running back LeSean McCoy.

The game is part of the NFL's long-term strategy to boost its international appeal, but also gives the league a valuable additional early morning slot for US television viewers.

It would be a fourth television slot for most NFL fans and one that has been dominated and largely created by coverage of English Premier League football matches.

Another unbeaten risks its perfect record when the Carolina Panthers entertain NFC East co-leader Philadelphia, 3-3, while divisional co-leader New York Giants (3-3) try to stay on top by beating Dallas (2-3).

Carolina boasts the third-best rushing team in the NFL, with quarterback Cam Newton running for 225 yards and three touchdowns, while the Eagles' defensive unit spends more than 34 minutes a game on the field and could face another long day chasing Newton. The Cowboys will use a third starting quarterback in six weeks as Matt Cassel gets the nod thanks to Tony Romo's broken collarbone and three Dallas losses in a row under backup Brandon Wheeden.—AFP

HAMILTON READY TO SCALE HIS OWN EVEREST

AUSTIN: Lewis Hamilton will achieve the dream of a lifetime if he secures his third Formula One world championship in Austin today but he will then face a question as big as Texas: What next?

Like a mountaineer one step away from conquering the highest peak, the Mercedes driver knows he also stands on the edge of uncertainty as he goes into the US Grand Prix.

Without wanting to preempt anything, go into 'ifs' and 'buts' or even acknowledge that the weekend felt in any way out of the ordinary, Hamilton recognised that he would have to refocus his career ambitions. "I could imagine that, for me it would be like getting to the top of Mount Everest. I mean,

what do you do next?" he said of the prospect of matching the three titles of his boyhood hero, the late Brazilian Ayrton Senna.

The answer for most would simply be win more championships and races, but Senna's triple has a particular resonance for Hamilton.

The 30-year-old, who has already overtaken the

The 30-year-old, who has already overtaken the Brazilian's tally of race wins, has always wanted to win three. Not seven like Michael Schumacher, or four like Sebastian Vettel, but to do what Senna did.

As he said in Japan two weeks ago, he never aspired to be like any other driver. "There's no higher mountain but there are equally tough challenges in maybe lower mountains. Things just change, so I

really don't know," said the Briton, as he continued to ponder how he might react. "I am going to keep on wanting to win. That is never going to change in me. That competitiveness I have in me is just in my blood. "The other day we were bowling with some people, and we had some girls with us and I could not for the life of me let them win. That competitiveness will always be there. I can't even fathom what's beyond it

"I never thought beyond three (titles). I didn't even think I would have two." Hamilton won his first title with McLaren in 2008, with his father present, and took his second with Mercedes last year in the final race-again with father and family present.

This time, he just has his pet bulldog 'Roscoe' for company and he said he was not expecting any family to join him. "At the moment it just feels like another weekend. It really, really does. Which I'm actually happy about," he told British reporters.

"Last year, the last race was an intense period-I might have it or might not have it. But now I'm in a good position with four races (to go).

"I've set up my mind up knowing I've got these four races to win the championship. My goal is to cross the line in Abu Dhabi as champion, not cross the line in Austin as champion. If it happens, then great but otherwise no extra pressure."

The Briton has won nine races in 15 this season

and could become the first champion to win 10 or more in successive years, as well as Britain's first back-to-back champion.

So will that make him a 'legend', one of the greats who transcends the sport? "I hope at some stage I might be. I think that would be a positive," said the sport's first black world champion. "I mean, I'm doing not too bad.

"When you look at those people who have done wonders in their sports and really stood out, I hope at some stage when I come to the end hopefully people will stay I did stood out. I do stick out like a sore thumb compared to the other drivers."—Reuters

KUZNETSOVA WINS KREMLIN CUP

MOSCOW: Stevtlana Kuznetsova swept aside a tired Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova 6-2, 6-1 to win the Kremlin Cup yesterday. Kuznetsova dominated throughout against a fellow Russian who acknowledged being exhausted as she played her 10th match in 12 days.

For the two-time Grand Slam winner Kuznetsova, it is her first title in her home country and comes at her 11th attempt at the Kremlin Cup. "Playing in Moscow's really hard for me because it's the one I want most. It's pretty much the same emotions as at Roland Garros," she said.

Kuznetsova hailed Pavlyuchenkova, who was struggling for fitness after she won the Generali Ladies tournament in Austria last week, as "a real fighter" for playing through the pain.

Pavlyuchenkova held serve with difficulty in the early stages but struggled to move around the court and was soon overwhelmed.

From 2-2 in the first set, Kuznetsova won the next ine games as she cruised to victory in 1 hour. 19 min-

utes. "It was painful that the final turned out like that but I'm happy that I made the final," Pavlyuchenkova said. "I couldn't put any pressure on my left leg when serving, so the serve wasn't working at all. Plus Sveta was playing great. It seemed everything was going her way." It was Kuznetsova's 15th career title and her first since the Citi Open in Washington in 2014. Pavlyuchenkova had been bidding to become only the second woman to retain the Kremlin Cup title, matching the 2004 achievement of Anastasia Myskina, who is now Kuznetsova's coach.

Top-seeded Marin Cilic of Croatia reached the men's final with a straightforward 6-3, 6-1 win over Russian wild-card entry Evgeny Donskoy. The big-serving Cilic faced just one break point as he held serve throughout, hitting 10 aces and landing 70 percent of first serves. In Sunday's final, he faces second-seeded Roberto Bautista Agut of Spain, who beat fourth-seeded German Philipp

CRITICISM GROWS FOR USE OF PINK BALL

MELBOURNE: Australia batsman Adam Voges has added his voice to the growing chorus of criticism of the pink ball set to be used in cricket's first day-night test match against New Zealand.

Voges was unimpressed with the ball's performance in the 50-over day-night tour match in Canberra on Friday and was highly sceptical it could last the 80 overs required in a test match. "There wasn't much pink left on it by the

end of the game," Voges told local media after New Zealand's 102-run win over the local Prime Minister's XI side. "The one that got hit onto the roof (by

New Zealand batsman Martin Guptill) and didn't come back was 28 overs old and it looked like it was 68 overs old to be fair.

"It looked as though the lacquer had come off and it was turning green basically. "There were bits of pink left, but it was more green than pink by the end.

"I know that it stopped swinging, there was no reverse-swing or anything like that because both sides get chunked up equally, but the older it gets, I can't see it being any easier to see."

New Zealand's batsmen had little trouble seeing the ball during the day at Manuka Oval, scoring over 300 in their innings, and their bowlers found ample swing early to rattle through the hosts' top order. But Voges said the ball quickly lost its venom. "Those first 10 overs were a real challenge but once the ball stopped swinging it was a lot easier and both balls got chewed up pretty quickly after that."

Fast bowler Peter Siddle echoed his team mate's comments but added that the hard Canberra pitch may not have been the best wicket to gauge its performance.

"Obviously the Manuka pitch here is a bit more abrasive than most pitches going around, but that was the most disappointing thing, was the ball sort of changing colour," he said on Melbourne radio station

"And it's a little bit hard to shine. It's not really like a traditional red ball where you can sort of buff it up and get it nice and shiny-you can't really do that with this ball." Cricket Australia have said the ball was ready for the day-night test match starting in Adelaide from Nov. 27.—Reuters

PAKISTAN TURN THE SCREW AFTER ENGLAND'S COLLAPSE

DUBAI: Misbah-ul-Haq and Younus Khan made halfcenturies as Pakistan ambled to 222 for three at the close on day three of the second Test yesterday, 358 runs ahead of England after Wahab Riaz and Yasir Shah had scuttled the tourists lower order before lunch.

It was a truly abject day for England who lost their final seven wickets for 36 runs to be all out for 242, wrecking their chances of becoming the first team to defeat Pakistan in a test series in the UAE.

That collapse meant England needed to bowl out Pakistan cheaply to stand any chance of a remarkable comeback and Alastair Cook's men got off to the best

Opener Shan Masood (one) had been fortunate as a diving Jos Buttler spilled his nick off Stuart Broad, but England's wicketkeeper made amends, snaffling anoth-

er Masood edge off James Anderson the following over. The hosts were one for one and Shoaib Malik (seven) lasted little longer, edging a full Mark Wood ball on to his stumps which reduced Pakistan to 16 for two.

But if England were hoping to spark a collapse similar to their own earlier surrender they were left disappointed as Pakistan's batsmen proved more obdurate.

Captain Cook used seven bowlers in the search for another breakthrough and Mohammad Hafeez (51) eventually fell after edging Wood to Joe Root at slip.

Starting their partnership at 83 for three, Younus and skipper Misbah were sensible, waiting to punish errant deliveries and taking minimal risks.

Younus passed 9,000 test runs and Pakistan's record scorer reached his 30th test half-century with a four to fine leg. Misbah got to his 31st test 50 after slogging the hapless Adil Rashid for two sixes in the same over. Younus reached the close on 71 not out with Misbah on 87.

MORNING COLLAPSE

Broad had predicted that the first hour could decide the test and his words proved prescient but in the opposite way that he would have hoped.

England started the day on 183 for three, Root and Jonny Bairstow seeking to extend their partnership of 55 against the contrasting threat of Wahab's scorching pace and Yasir's canny leg-spin.

After three scoreless overs, England's batsmen registered 24 runs in the next three and seemed at ease. But Wahab (4-66) removed Root (88), Ben Stokes (four) and Buttler (nought), all caught by wicketkeeper Sarfraz Ahmed, as the 30-year-old's devastating four-over spell yielded three wickets for just one run. Only Bairstow offered any sustained resistance.

The support batsmen were too easily panicked in scenes reminiscent of Pakistan's 3-0 whitewash of England in 2012, also in the UAE.

Yasir (4-93) dismissed Rashid (nought), caught by Hafeez in the covers, and Bairstow (46) Ibw in the same over as England slumped to 223 for eight.

Wood (one) was Yasir's final victim via Younus at slips and Anderson (four) was last out, looping a catch to Sarfraz off Imran Khan. Abu Dhabi's first test was drawn. Sharjah will host the final game in the series from Nov. 1.—Reuters

pressive penalty shoot-out victory over League Two side Carlisle, which had ended 1-1 after 120 minutes.

Christian Benteke has been absent with a hamstring strain for a month, Roberto Firmino for around the same length of time with a back injury, while Daniel Sturridge has missed the last two matches with a knee injury sustained in

The news on Benteke and Firmino is good; both returned as substitutes against Rubin Kazan, and ought to be available to play at least some part on Sunday.

For Sturridge, the diagnosis is more of a concern. Klopp had hoped to bring him back against Southampton, but the striker now requires another scan on his knee.

"It's not much better at the moment," Klopp said. "With Daniel's injury, we have to see day by day. "If he can train completely normally late yesterday, then it's no problem and he's an option. But I have to wait for this. "He needs treatment and a scan because there's a little fluid in the knee. We have to see." Benteke is likely to start if he is anywhere near fit enough to do so; if not, then Divock Origi - yet to score in five appearances for Liverpool - may be asked to lead the attack for a third successive

Southampton manager Ronald Koeman is concerned the attention surrounding Klopp could prove a distraction as his side try to recover from squandering a two-goal lead in a 2-2 draw against Leicester City last

"I think you have to be focused in your job as a manager to prepare your team for the game and the players to prepare to play on the level what we expect of the players," he said.

"We know Liverpool's a big team, a big history and they will get always more attention than Southampton. That's nor-

nagers don't win and managers don't lose, it's the players between the white lines who make decisions and put the quality in. "I think it's too much talking about managers. Talk about the teams, because they are more important."—AFP



SCHWEINSTEIGER KEEN FOR **MANCHESTER DERBY KICKS**

MANCHESTER: The Manchester derby is no longer a clash of warring Mancunian tribes, but today's 170th instalment at Old Trafford carries a fascination for overseas players like Manchester United's Bastian Schweinsteiger.

Twenty years ago both teams boasted Manchester-born players, with Nicky Butt, Paul Scholes and the Neville brothers lining up for United against City's homegrown cohort of Richard Edghill, Garry Flitcroft and Nicky Summerbee, son of former Maine Road great Mike Summerbee.

There will not be one Mancunian on the pitch at kick-off this weekend, as Premier League leaders City cross town to third-place United, but

what the game has lost in local connections it has gained in worldwide renown. "I think it is something very special and we should be very happy that we have two big clubs in one city that are also playing in the Champions League," Germany midfielder Schweinsteiger told United's match-day programme.

"I remember when I was in (Bayern) Munich we were always looking for that, but the other team at 1860 Munich didn't play so well! Here, we can play lots of derbies and I am very happy about that."

The game's global pull was demonstrated on Friday

when City received a visit from no less a figure than the Chinese president Xi Jinping, a reputed United fan, who was in Britain on a state trip. For both City and Unitedfounded, respectively, by a pair of church wardens and a group of railwaymen in the latter part of the 19th century-it was a reminder of the extraordinary reach that they now exert.

Both feature in the top five of Forbes magazine's list of the world's most valuable football clubs, but it is for the earthy intensity of their on-pitch encounters that their rivalry enjoys such a broad appeal.

Another player set for his derby bow is City's Belgian forward Kevin De Bruyne, who continued his excellent start to life in Manchester with an injury-time winner against Sevilla in the Champions League on Wednesday.

De Bruyne's last game at Old Trafford came in August 2013, in a 0-0 draw with Chelsea that was to be his last league start for the London

Back in England via a storming spell at Wolfsburg, De Bruyne has urged City not to abandon the attacking approach that has seen them amass 11 goals in their last two league games.

"We shouldn't play defensive because our main strength lies in going forward, though we need to stay disciplined," he told the City web-

"We know it will be difficult. Man United

have been a top team for a long time and the rivalry between us and them obviously runs deep, but the season is very long.

"That said, we know what it means to our supporters and it would be nice if we could go there and get three points." While City-two points above United in the tableplayed at home in the Champions League this week, United had to endure a long trip back from Russia following their 1-1 draw at CSKA Moscow. Both United manager Louis van Gaal and his City counterpart Manuel Pellegrini have played down the significance of the match in the context of the title race, citing the season's embryonic state, but with so much emotion invested in the game, there are points to be scored.—AFP

Bayern rack up 1000th w

BERLIN: Arjen Robben netted on his return from injury as Bayern Munich romped to a 4-0 home win against Cologne yesterday to claim their 1000th victory in the Bundesliga.

With second-placed Borussia Dortmund hosting Augsburg on Sunday, league leaders Bayern took their chance to extend the gap at the top to 10 points in picking up their 10th straight league win of the season. Pep Guardiola's side became the first team to record 1000 Bundesliga victories as Netherlands captain Robben scored in his first match since August while Arturo Vidal, Robert Lewandowski and Thomas Mueller also got on the scoresheet.

The Bavarian giants bounced back from the disappointment of Tuesday's 2-0 defeat at Arsenal in the Champions League-their first loss of the season-in emphatic style.

"This is for all the coaches, fans, players and employees who made this victory possible," said Guardiola, whose side fired in 26 shots to Cologne's four. "1000 victories is outstanding."

Having been named in the starting line-up after a groin injury, Robben netted after 35 minutes before Vidal doubled their lead five minutes later when he converted Kingsley

Coman's superb pass from the flank. "I'm pleased for him," said Guardiola. "We have missed his quality. Arjen has a professionalism, a charisma and a mentality, especially in the one-on-ones.

"He still needs more time, but no one has his nose for goal." Poland striker Lewandowski cemented his place as the league's top scorer when he headed home on 62 minutes for his 13th goal in nine league games this season.

Mueller made it 4-0 on 77 minutes when he converted a penalty after Lewandowski was fouled in the area. Wolfsburg stayed fourth with a 1-0 win at Darmstadt as Daniel Caligiuri hit their 78th minute winner. Fresh from their 4-4 draw at home to Roma in the Champions League on Tuesday, Bayer Leverkusen had to come from 2-0 down before beating Stuttgart 4-3 in another thriller.

The first half was goalless, but Stuttgart took a 2-0 lead through Martin Harnik and Daniel Didavi. Germany winger Karim Bellarabi made it 2-1 on 57 minutes before midfielder Lukas Rupp netted for the visitors' to make it 3-1 with

an hour played. Two goals in two minutes from Poland defender Sebastian Boenisch and Mexico striker Javier Hernandez levelled the scores before Swiss striker Admir Mehmedi netted the 89thminute winner.

The victory lifted Leverkusen to fifth while Stuttgart remain in the bottom three. Nigeria striker Anthony Ujah scored twice as Werder Bremen broke their five-match losing streak with a 3-1 win at Mainz where Japan striker Yoshinori Muto scored the hosts' consolation goal in the 90th minute.

The result lifted Bremen out of the relegation zone and up to 14th while Mainz dropped to 13th. Midfielder Marc Stendera was Eintracht Frankfurt's star with both of their second-half goals in a 2-1 comeback victory at Hanover 96, who hang just above the relegation places.

Hertha Berlin are fifth after their 1-0 win at Bavarian side Ingolstadt on Satruday night when ex-Bayern Munich midfielder Mitchell Weiser scored the winner after just 11 minutes.

Ten-man Hoffenheim are second-from-bottom after their 1-0 defeat to Hamburg on Friday thanks to Pierre-Michel Lasogga's late winner. Hoffenheim's Bosnian defender Ermin Bicakcic was sent off for a second yellow card.—AFP

RONALDO ON TARGET, EAL END CELTA RUN

MADRID: Real Madrid inflicted Celta Vigo's first defeat of the season to move three points clear at the top of La Liga thanks to a 3-1 win at Balaidos yesterday.

Cristiano Ronaldo and Danilo struck within the first 23 minutes for Madrid, who were also grateful to another spectacular goalkeeping display from Keylor Navas to keep

Celta were reduced to 10 men just 12 minutes into the second-half when Gustavo Cabral was dismissed for a second bookable offence, but they still pushed Madrid all the way as Nolito set up a grandstand finish five minutes from time when he fired into the top corner.

However, Marcelo rounded off the scoring with the final kick of the game. Victory takes Madrid three points clear of Celta and Barcelona, who entertain Eibar today.

"We had a lot of chances to finish the game before," said Madrid boss Rafael Benitez. "In the end we had to suffer because we needed the third goal, but we have to take the positives which is to come to such a difficult place after

playing PSG on Wednesday and get a great result." Meanwhile, Nolito admitted that Navas had just been too good. "We have to congratulate him because he stopped three of four clear goals which I don't know how he saved," he told Canal Plus.

Both sides' unbeaten record this season was on the line, but despite their exertions against Paris Saint-Germain in the Champions League in midweek and a host of injuries to key players, it was Madrid who started the brighter.

That early dominance was rewarded on eight minutes when Lucas Vazquez's cut-back trickled through to Ronaldo who smashed home his 12th goal in as many games this season.

Celta had thrashed Barcelona 4-1 last month and going behind appeared to shock the Galicians back into their early season form as Fabian Orellana forced Navas into his first and arguably best save of the afternoon as he flew to his right to turn the Chilean's volley behind.

The hosts' attacking intent worked against them midway through the half, though, as Jese Rodriguez picked out Danilo in acres of space on the counter-attack and the Brazilian took his time before dispatching his first goal for the club beyond Sergio Alvarez.

Navas then took centre stage at the other end of the field as he made stunning saves from lago Aspas and Pablo Hernandez just before the break to continue his amazing start to the season. Celta started on the front foot after the break too as

Orellana curled just wide from the edge of the area. However, any hope of a comeback from the hosts was extinguished when Cabral saw a stupid second yellow card for protesting towards referee Clos Gomez. Madrid should have taken advantage of the extra man

when Ronaldo fired straight at Alvarez before the Celta 'keeper did brilliantly to turn Isco's effort onto the bar. Even when Celta did eventually beat Navas, Marcelo

was on hand to clear Nolito's goalbound effort off the line. Yet, Nolito brought the game to life once more with a stunning effort into the top corner for his seventh goal of the season five minutes from time.

And Celta should have been level seconds later when substitute John Guidetti shot wide when unmarked just six yards out. Instead, it was Marcelo who scored for the second consecutive league game when he slotted home at the near post to make it 3-1. —AFP

VARDY MAINTAINS HOT STREAK TO SINK PALACE

Buoyed by yet another dramatic comeback, a Vardy-inspired 2-2 draw at Southampton last weekend, Leicester made a vibrant start against Palace and almost took the lead on three occasions in

the space of two minutes.

Palace's final fling came when they appealed for a penalty after Wilfried Zaha tumbled under a challenge from Fuchs, but referee Mike Dean booked the winger for diving.—AFP

GERMANY SEEKS RIGHT OF REPLY OVER 'CASH-FOR-VOTES' ROW

BERLIN: The German Football Association (DFB) has reportedly requested a right of reply in magazine Spiegel to refute the cashfor-votes allegations surrounding the awarding of the 2006 World Cup to Germany. According to the website MEEDIA, the DFB's lawyer Christian Schertz has sent four demands for a right of reply to the Hamburgbased publication. The DFB was unavailable for comment yesterday. The DFB is in crisis over claims in a recent Spiegel report that the 2006 World Cup bidding committee accepted a 10.3 million Swiss francs (6.7 million euros at the time) loan from ex-Adidas chief Robert Louis-Dreyfus. Spiegel alleges that the loan was used to buy the votes of four Asian members of FIFA's 24-strong executive committee to ensure the 2006 World Cup was awarded to Germany.

DFB president Wolfgang Niersbach has always been categoric that there had been nothing shady about the 2002 payment. "There was no slush fund, there was no vote buying," he has said.

Under German media law, any individual or organisation has the right to refute any claims made against them by an outlet in

print or online. All four demands submitted by the DFB are directed towards parts of the Spiegel article where they insist there is no evidence or details to back up the allegations made and they are set be included in next Saturday's edition. On Thursday, Niersbach claimed the 6.7 million-euro payment was made to FIFA as an upfront payment transferred in order to secure a 170 million euro subsidy from world football's governing body. However, FIFA quickly refuted Niersbach's version in a strongly-worded statement and called on the DFB to cooperate with its investigation.

Ex-DFB president Theo Zwanziger has told Spiegel he was certain that there was a slush fund, contradicting Niersbach's claims and accusing him of lying. "It is clear that there was a slush fund in the German World Cup bidding process," he said in an interview published yesterday. "It is also clear that the current DFB president (Niersbach) knew of this already in 2005, and not only a few weeks ago as he claimed," added Zwanziger, who headed the German Football Association from 2006 to 2012. "The way I see it, Niersbach is lying," he claimed.—AFP

If people don't give everything, we'll come up short. "There's no shortage in desire, but the quality is not quite there. We're not world-beaters. Our league position suggests we're not and today wasn't our day." Sherwood, 46, was appointed last February following the dismissal of Paul Lambert. He helped Villa avoid relegation and led them to a first FA Cup final appearance since 2000 after a 2-1 defeat of Liverpool in the semi-finals, only for the Midlands club to lose 4-0 to Arsenal in the final. —AFP



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ARSENAL DOWN EVERTON TO CLIMB ON TOP



LONDON: Arsenal moved to the top of the Premier League for the first time since February 2014 after first half goals from Olivier Giroud and Laurent Koscielny secured a 2-1 victory over Everton yesterday.

Arsene Wenger's side climbed one point above Manchester City, 24 hours before the previous leaders face neighbours United in the Manchester derby.

And while Everton threatened to deny Arsenal top spot when Ross Barkley struck just before the interval, Wenger's side comfortably claimed a fourth successive win. A frustrating afternoon for Everton at Emirates Stadium was complete when Gareth Barry was sent off in the closing moments after collecting a second yellow card.

The result extended Everton's 19-year

wait for a victory at Arsenal, while for Wenger's men, the result was further confirmation that their campaign is at last gather-A crucial Champions League success

against Bayern Munich on Tuesday undeniably provided a major lift after a season until recently marked by Arsenal's familiar inconsistencies. Wenger had already come in for heavy

criticism, particularly after the home defeats to West Ham and Olympiakos, but the manner of the midweek win against the German champions demonstrated the strengths of his squad.

And Wenger was keen to point out in the

build-up to this game that his side are now more mature and less fragile than the team of two years ago that failed to sustain their title challenge.

Like Wenger, Everton boss Roberto Martinez also focused on his side's mentality before kick-off, warning his players they would have to adjust their mindset if they were to bring an end to their dismal away record at Arsenal and other top clubs.

Old Trafford and Anfield have proven to be equally unhappy venues for the Merseysiders although their record this season-Martinez's side were unbeaten on the road coming into the game-suggested they had a chance of turning things around.

The visitors managed to contain Wenger's team during the opening half hour, although there were signs of the weakness that would cost them when Giroud and Gabriel Paulista both easily won headers from Santi Cazorla corners.

Arsenal eventually exploited their aerial advantage to take control of the game with two goals in two minutes. First, Mesut Ozil hoisted a beautifully flighted cross towards Giroud in the 36th minute, allowing the striker-who had drifted away from Phil Jagielka-to flick a backward header over

the stranded Tim Howard. The Everton keeper had been caught in two minds, but Howard had little chance moments later when Cazorla delivered a superb free-kick towards the edge of sixyard box.

Jagielka was again caught napping as Koscielny was able to reach the ball first and the centre-back needed only to make slight contact to divert the ball past

A previously tight game was now tilted emphatically in Arsenal's favor, but Everton brought themselves back into it two minutes before the break through the excellent Barkley and a huge slice of luck The England international was sent clear by a sweeping pass from Gerard Deulofeu and his left-foot shot caught Petr Cech out after taking a heavy deflection off Gabriel.

The goal provided Everton with the perfect boost before the interval, but rather than lifting the visitors, it appeared to inspire Arsenal to step up their efforts and ensure they did not squander the points. Arsenal dominated from the opening moments of the second period, yet they struggled to find the third goal that would provide them with breathing space.

Howard reacted well to smother an opportunity for Alexis Sanchez and then saved well from Giroud's acrobatic volley before the France striker hit the bar. A Romelu Lukaku header struck the woodwork to hand Arsenal a late scare but Wenger's side stood firm. — AFP

MOURINHO BANISHED AS CHELSEA GLOOM DEEPENS



LONDON: Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho was banished to the stands amid more furore over refereeing decisions as his side slumped to a 2-1 defeat at West Ham United yesterday.

Nemanja Matic was sent off in the first half for two bookable offences with Mourinho's men already trailing to Mauro Zarate's goal.

The second yellow came directly after a disallowed Chelsea goal that had seemed legitimate and following an earlier incident when goal-line technology ruled out another effort that did not quite cross the line. Mourinho has already earned himself a fine and a suspended stadium ban for repeatedly claiming officials have a vendetta against him and his team.

And he was sent to the stands for the whole of the second half by referee Jon Moss, who had earlier expelled first-team coach Silvino Louro from the technical areas.

Asmir Begovic did well to tip over Dimitri Payet's free-kick, but Diego Costa could only divert the resulting corner to where Zarate was lurking on the right of the box and the Argentinian drove

Upton Park erupted, the home fans serenading Mourinho with the inevitable chants of "You're getting sacked in the morning!" and "You're not special

Cesar Azpilicueta was booked for fouling Zarate before Ramires failed to atone for his error by blasting another long-ranger well over.

The champions penned in their hosts for a spell that saw home goalkeeper Adrian make a diving save to keep out Willian's free-kick and Manuel Lanzini hook away a header from Kurt Zouma. The comments from Yi Gang, vice governor of the People's Bank of China, appeared to be aimed at reassuring investors this level of growth, China's slowest pace in two decades but still faster than other major economies, is the Chinese economy's "new normal".

"China's future economic growth will still be relatively quick. Around seven, six-point-some-

thing. These will all be very normal," he told a conference in Beijing. As well as cutting interest rates on Friday, the PBOC lowered the amount of cash that banks must hold as

Both moves were bids to jumpstart growth in China's slowing economy, a drag on global growth that has been of major concern in emerging markets and other leading

Monetary policy easing in the world's second-largest economy is at its most aggressive since the 2008/09 financial crisis, as growth looks set to slip to a 25-year-low this

year of under 7 percent.

Yi said China in the future would lower the reserve requirement ratio for banks, the amount of cash that major lenders need to keep on hand - at a "normal" pace. "Our reserve requirement ratio is still at a relatively high level so there is still room to lower the RRR. In future, we will proceed to lower the RRR at a normal pace," he said.

Yi said the PBOC planned to keep interest rates at a reasonable level to reduce the corporate debt burden, and noted that interest rate liberalization does not mean that the central bank would reduce regulation of rates. China

will also continue to set benchmark lending and deposit rates for some time, he said, but these rates would not restrict market pricing.

Data released on Monday showed China's economy in the July-to-September quarter grew 6.9 percent from a year earlier, dipping below 7 percent for the first time since the global financial crisis.

Yi noted that China's stock market, which has fallen sharply since June, had completed most of its adjustments and that the yuan, which was buffeted in the wake of a surprise devaluation in early August, had "basically" stabilized. "Following Aug. 11, our original inten-

tion was to pursue market reforms. But after that, we realized there was a relatively big depreciation pressure (on the yuan), and so we decided to resolutely stabilize the yuan," he

The PBOC was looking into leverage levels in the debt market, Yi noted. He said that China did not have exceptionally high debt levels, and while the bank was not overly anxious about cutting the level of leverage in the economy, the overall strategy is to stabilize leverage levels. "I want to especially mention this: I am now also focused on the leverage level in China's debt market," he said. —Reuters

AMERICAN AIRLINES Q3 PROFIT SOARS ON CHEAPER JET FUEL

FORT WORTH, Texas: American Airlines plans to offer a version of the low-fare, nofrills approach to flying that is boosting profit margins at discount carriers. Officials at American, the world's biggest airline, say they need to fight back against small but fast-growing rivals including Spirit Airlines and Frontier Airlines, which are known for cheap fares, lots of extra fees, and poor service.

American has many frequent fliers who will pay more for premium service, said Scott Kirby, the airline's president. But 87 percent - accounting for half of American's revenue - fly the airline no more than once a year, and they buy airline tickets based on price, he said.

"We have to compete for them," Kirby said. "We can't just walk away from that size of the business."

So beginning next year American will offer tickets with "less frills" but a "really cheap price" where it competes on nonstop flights with discount carriers, Kirby said. He declined to provide more details.

Kirby also said that American will change its AAdvantage frequent-flier program next year, but he declined to give details on that either. Other airlines have changed their plans from miles to points - a way of rewarding high spenders at the expense of customers who buy cheap tickets.

American disclosed its plans as executives discussed the company's record-breaking third-quarter profit. American Airlines Group Inc. reported that net income jumped 80 percent to \$1.69 billion thanks to a huge drop in fuel spending.

But American's shares fell 4.7 percent apparently on concern that price-cutting to compete with Spirit and Frontier might erode profits - before they recovered most of the loss. Spirit's stock took a bigger hit - it fell 9 percent during intraday trading. Frontier shares are not publicly traded.

Big airlines like American, Delta and United chase high-dollar business travelers with amenities such as lie-flat seats and fancy food in premium cabins and route networks that span the globe. But discounters, which include Mexico's Volaris and Norwegian Air Shuttle, are growing rapidly by appealing to consumers who want to fly as cheaply as possible.

Spirit has been possibly the most suc-

At \$2.77 per share, the results beat the average forecast of \$2.72 per share by 15 analysts surveyed by FactSet and nine analysts surveyed by Zacks Investment Research.

Fort Worth-based American also announced a \$2 billion addition to its program of buying back its own stock over the next 15 months, a move that usually pleases shareholders by making existing shares more valuable. That raises the amount authorized this year for buybacks to \$6 billion. The company also declared a quarterly dividend of 10 cents per share.

Shares of most US airlines ended trading higher, but American was down 32 cents to \$45.67 - it hit a low of \$43.81 during the day - and Spirit Airlines Inc. tumbled \$3.25, or 7.6 percent, to \$39.79. —AP

NEW DEPUTY OF IG **METALL SAYS GOOD WORK WON HER FANS**

FRANKFURT: Christiane Benner has to think long and hard about how she became the most powerful woman in German trade unionism. "I think my good work won them over. That's the only way to do it," she says at last, as though considering the question for the first time, in an office filled with bouquets sent in tribute to her historic election.

Benner, 47, was picked this week as deputy leader of IG Metall, Germany's biggest trade union, which represents 2.3 million engineering and metal workers at companies including Volkswagen and Siemens. Her election is a sign of the times; not only is she the first woman elected to such high office in a predominantly male trade union, but her speciality is information technology.

Benner has concentrated on IT for almost two decades, and focuses on "click-workers": contractors who work remotely, often from home, doing project work such as processing Internet data, paid on a piece-rate basis. It's not the kind of work commonly associated with heavy industry but, as more and more industrial research and development work is moved onto Internet platforms, IG Metall

needs to reach out to such workers, Benner says. "IG Metall will transform itself," she told Reuters in an interview on Friday. "We know exactly what's going on. There will be upheaval."

The digitisation of industry will be a central issue for IG Metall over the next years, with new leader Joerg Hofmann, 59, concentrating on the prospects for traditional factory workers whose tasks are being taken over by robots and more automation.

IG Metall is campaigning for these workers to be trained in higher IT functions to save them from becoming redundant. Benner almost didn't make it into the ranks of IG Metall's top officials at all: two years ago, the union planned to reduce its executive board to five from seven members, but the motion was unexpectedly rejected and Benner was voted in.

Trained as a sociologist, Benner was active in union work at her then employer, mechanical engineering firm Carl Schenck AG, in her early 20s. She took a break to study and travel before returning to Germany and becoming a full-time union official. —Reuters

\$30BN WORTH OF PROJECTS AWARDED SO FAR IN KUWAIT

KUWAIT: The total value of projects awarded in Kuwait in 2015 climbed to KD 9 billion (\$30 billion) by the end of the third quarter. Kuwait's project market, which has lagged behind other GCC countries in the past, is second only to Saudi Arabia in terms of the value of contracts awarded so far this year. An exceptional Q3 saw the contracts awarded for the New Airport Terminal, the New Refinery at Al-Zour, as well as over a \$1 billion worth of road upgrades in southern Kuwait.

According to MEED Projects, the total value of Kuwait's projects market (planned and active) grew to over KD 74.3 billion (\$246 billion) by the end of September 2015.

Below is a breakdown of developments relating to Kuwait's major projects so far this year. The detailed status of selected strategic projects is also included in Table 2 on the final page of this brief.

Oil & gas

The contract signing ceremony for Kuwait National Petroleum Company's (KNPC) KD 3.9 billion New Refinery Project at Al-Zourwas rescheduled for 13 October after a decision by Kuwait's oil ministry to postpone the ceremony. Although the delay might affect investor confidence, the authorities insisted that the contracts be reviewed for any potential loopholes before being signed, sometime in the next few weeks. Businesses in Al-Zour (south of Kuwait) have already vacated the area, ahead of the planned site preparation work. Among those handed eviction notices by the Ahmadi governorate was Saudi-Chevron (according to press reports), the company responsible for operating Saudi Arabia's 50 percent share of the Wafra oilfield in the divided Neutral Zone.

The new Al-Zour refinery is expected to be completed in 45 months. Once operational, the refinery will have a capacity of 615,000 barrels per day(b/d). Along with last year's award of the Clean Fuels project, Kuwait's refineries will be



the East Raudhatain, West Raudhatain, West Sabriya and Umm Niqa oil fields. The project is divided into three packages, with each package having a production target of 40,000 barrels of oil equivalent a day (oil and gas).

According to MEED Projects, the Ministry of Public Works (MPW) issued a Request for Prequalification (RFQ) for the Al-Jahra Ministerial Complex, a new government center to be created in the north. The contract for KD 347 million is scheduled to be tendered next year. Meanwhile, work is underway at the KD 388 million Al-Jahra hospital which is managed by the Amiri Diwan. The Public Authority for Housing (PAHW) has commenced distributing plots in South Al-Mutlaa City. Set for completion in 2018with 29,000 residential units, the city is designed to be the largest in northern Kuwait. Government plans to develop Boubyan Island and Madinat Al-Hareer (City of Silk) north of the city, remain uncertain, however.

The PAHW, which is in a race against time to provide housing for 110 thousand applicants, signed a KD 46 million construction contract with Turkey's Limak in early October. The contract for infrastructure work in the West Abdullah Mubarak area should see the creation of 5,200 residential units by October 2017, the scheduled completion date. In September, the Kuwait Authority for Partnership Projects (KAPP) revived the South Al-Jahra Labor City project. The project aims to house 20,000workers. A request for proposal for the project's transaction advisory contract was issued in September, with a bid deadline of 29 October 2015.

FRENCH FAMILY DEFIANT AS AIRPORT DEVELOPERS PUSH TO EVICT THEM

VIGNEUX-DE-BRETAGNE, FRANCE: A family of four, who have lived through years of sometimes violent protests at the site of a controversial airport in western France say they have no plans to move, despite a court ruling which could see them evicted within a month. Bailiffs arrived at the home of Virginie Olmos and Sebastien Martin on Wednesday morning with a cheque for 18,000 euros (\$20,000) in compensation for their moving expenses. But the

couple did not accept the money.

If they refuse, the airport developers, who own the house they rent, would have the right to begin formal expulsion proceedings. The house stands on a 1,650-hectare (4,000-acre) site of protected swampland called Notre-Dame Des Landes, just outside the western city of Nantes where developers want to build an airport they say will provide a major boost to tourism in western France.

Approved in 2008, the 580-million-euro (\$747 million) project was due to start in 2014 but its start has been repeatedly delayed due to fierce opposition by environmental protesters. The airport developers call the area the 'Zone d'amenagement differe (ZAD)' a technical term meaning the site as been earmarked for construction.

But a resolute group of anti-airport protesters who have occupied the area have re-baptized it the 'Zone a Defendre (ZAD)' or zone to defend. Today, everyone in this part of France simply refers to the site as the ZAD.

Shattering the fairytale

Olmos and her family moved into the house in 2000 after her father, the local postman, came across the property while on his rounds. When the couple signed their tenancy agreement, they say plans to build the airport were on stand-by and they didn't expect the situation to change.

Their second son, now 12, was born in what Olmos refers to as her "magic house". The house, which covers 150 square metres, looks like something out of a fairy tale. With a small turret on one corner, it stands in the middle of a hectare (2.5 acres) of land filled with birds and animals including emus, parrots, a baboon, goats, ducks and geese.

For more than a decade, life in their woodland hideaway was very calm. But that came to an abrupt end in November 2012 when a series of violent clashes between French riot police and environmentalists protesting against the airport exploded right outside her

From that point, the family was "stuck behind the barricades" set up by the protesters. There were no more school buses and rubbish collection services were halted. They were forced to do everything on foot, walking

through the woods and fields to reach the nearest shops which were almost a kilometre away. It took some time but eventually they learned to live alongside the protestors and today have a good relationship with the socalled 'ZADists'.

A community of eco-activists who promote alternative models of economic development, the protesters have built a network of tree houses, cabins, and collective farms across the site where the future airport is slated to be

Learning self-sufficiency

"They taught us to be more self-sufficient and to have a better relationship with nature," Olmos said.

"But everything will stop if the airport is built." Pointing to the surrounding trees and fields, she says the area is earmarked for a huge

Martin says he still can't believe that the

developers resumed the eviction procedures that had been suspended for three years on the orders of President François Hollande, while the appeals were being held. The respite came to an end after a court in July rejected all the protesters' objections to the airport.

"Unless we find another house, we're not leaving," Martin said. And so far they've seen nothing. "We've visited five or six houses but we've never found anything equivalent to here, with land for the animals," he said. Olmos works as a hairdresser and Martin as a selfemployed builder and the couple say they do not earn enough to be able to buy a new house, even though the developers have not charged them rent on their current home for the past three years.

So, for the time being, they are going nowhere. "When the police come back to try and move us out, I'm sure there'll be a lot of people here to help us," insists Olmos, feisty to the end. — AFP

ECONOMIC WOES FUEL PUERTO RICAN EXODUS TO US

MIAMI: Maritza Alameda saw no future in Puerto Rico, so she and her family moved to Florida, joining what has become a mass exodus as migration from the Caribbean island hits levels unseen in half a century. Puerto Rico is a territory of the United States although not a state. Its people are US citizens-and they have not missed out on the chance, faced with the island's economic woes, to seek a better life elsewhere.

After losing his job, Maritza's husband Abimael Rivera moved to Florida to try his luck. When he got a job as a truck driver, his wife and two children came to join him.

At home in Puerto Rico "there is no work, but prices rise. So how can we live?", Maritza Alameda asked AFP. But she admits this first year in Florida has been tough. "I cried every night," said the 42year-old. Puerto Rico has been in recession for nearly a decade, fuelling the exodus to the US mainland-which in turn is further depressing the local economy.

Last year 83,800 people left for the United States, a level not seen since the so-called great migration of the 1950s when nearly half a million people emigrated to the mainland, according to a recent report from the Pew Research Center.

What kind of life is this?

Laura Homar says she emigrated in 2013, after falling out of love with the island. "Everyone tells me I did the right thing by leaving," said the 55year-old, who said she is happy now working as a translator helping Latinos in hospitals and prisons in Minneapolis, Minnesota, where she lives with her elder daughter, her boyfriend and their dog.

"The economic crisis triggers more crime, brings more problems. A lot of doctors are leaving Puerto Rico, and to get health care it is very difficult," she said. "The cost of food, health insurance and electricity are ridiculously expensive. Basic utilities are extremely expensive."

Puerto Ricans are saddled with a huge \$73 billion debt load that has earned the island the nickname "America's Greece". US officials have urged Congress to push through new laws to reform Puerto Rico's finances, warning that without swift action it will run out of money. Governor Alejandro Garcia-Padilla himself has acknowledged the debt is too big to pay back. He says territory may soon have to choose between paying its creditors and providing basic services to its

Vicious cycle

The exodus from Puerto Rico to the United States hit record levels last year, but the flow has been building steadily for a decade, said Jorge Duany, a professor at Florida International University and an expert on the migration pattern. In 2006 it was observed for the first time that there were more Puerto Ricans living off the island than on it. Today some 3.5 million live on Puerto Rico, and five million on the continental United States. The trend shows no signs of stopping. The latest census forecasts the island's population to slump to three million or fewer by 2050.

This is a bad thing for Puerto Rico in more ways than one, experts say. Fewer inhabitants means less consumption, Duany said. "It is a kind of vicious cycle, because with less consumption there is less economic activity, and more incentive to leave the country."

The exodus is also modifying the social makeup of the island. Because those who leave tend to be young, the population is getting older. Puerto Rico has seen a decline in the number of kids in school, and its fertility rate is lower than on the mainland, said Jens Manuel Krogstad, who wrote the Pew report.

"As population has declined in Puerto Rico all these problems have cropped up," Krogstad said. "It can become a very difficult cycle to break." — AFP

Venezuela sues black market

suit on Friday with allegations of "cyber-terrorism" against a US-based website that tracks the OPEC member's currency black market.

The DolarToday site (dolartoday.com) has enraged President Nicolas Maduro's government by publishing a rate in Venezuelan bolivars for the greenback far higher than the three official levels under Venezuela's 12-year-long currency controls. The rate has become an unofficial marker in the crisis-ridden economy, with some Venezuelans using it in private transactions or to fix prices of imported goods.

The lawsuit, in the US District Court for the District of Delaware, named three Venezuelans in the United States as being behind the site: Gustavo Diaz, Ivan Lozada and Jose Altuve.

A representative of DolarToday could not immediately be reached by email or telephone for comment. The Central Bank requested both an injunction and damages, accusing the three of fanning inflation in Venezuela, the world's highest, and enriching themselves by illegal

"Defendants conspired to use a form of cyber-terrorism to wreak, and in fact they have wreaked, economic and reputational harm on the Central Bank by impeding its ability to manage the Republic's economy and foreign exchange system," the lawsuit said.

DolarToday, which takes an aggressively anti-Maduro stance in its publications and says it calculates its rate based on trades on the Venezuela-Colombia border, guoted the dollar at 820 bolivars on Friday.

That is 130 times the strongest official rate of 6.3 bolivars and four times the government's weakest rate of 200. Maduro, a former bus driver and foreign minister who won election to replace Hugo Chavez in 2013, frequently lambastes DolarToday as part of an international capitalist conspiracy to sabotage the economy and undermine socialism in Venezuela.

"Arbitrarily manufacturing currency exchange rates creates further turmoil in a country that is working to overcome the obstacles it already faces," said Adam Fox, a lawyer for US law firm Squire Patton Boggs, which repre-

Critics say Venezuela's economic mess, with Gross Domestic Product shrinking and shortages widespread, is the result of hardline state policies such as currency controls.

The Central Bank estimated a million people visit the DolarToday site daily. Its Twitter account has 1.93 million followers. "Defendants have been playing 'a cyber cat-and-mouse game," to circumvent government blocks, it said. Central Bank officials in Caracas had no immediate comment. — Reuters

MYANMAR ANTI-DRUG CRUSADERS UNCOVER \$500K LEDGER OF PAYOFFS

HPAKANT, MYANMAR: Residents of this town in northern Myanmar's opium country became their own drug investigators out of frustration with authorities' failure to keep heroin and methamphetamine addiction from consuming their villages. Now they say they have an explanation for officials' poor performance, thanks to a woman charged with drugdealing who kept careful track of her expenses.

When the community-based Kachin Anti-Drug Committee made a citizen's arrest of the suspect, it found two notebooks listing a combined \$500,000 in payoffs to authorities in Kachin state including an army commander, top police officials, anti-drug officers, township officials and others.

The committee showed The Associated Press photos of the ledger but did not provide line-item details on payoffs and recipients, saying it is trying to get authorities to improve drug enforcement

and is using the notebooks as leverage. The group Global Witness, which campaigns against corruption and for transparency and protection of people's rights in use of mining, logging and other resources, viewed the document and agreed with the committee's description of the contents. "For us, this book is useful for negotiating to try to get the government officials and police involved in our project," Naw Lawn, secretary of the committee, told the AP. "Our society is being destroyed by drugs. We have many young people who are addicts, and this is destroying our future."

Poor response

Officials with the state anti-drug police force failed to respond to repeated requests for comment. Naw Lawn and other community leaders set up their group last year to fight the surge in drug use in Kachin, an ethnically diverse, mostly Christian region where the Kachin Baptist Convention is the most influential local institution. With Myanmar's government attempting to end a decades-long insurgency by members of the ethnic Kachin minority, authorities have accepted the committee's assistance.

Isolated by a lack of paved roads or other modern transport and by fighting between rebel insurgents and government forces, Hpakant is a frontier region marked by huge jade-mining operations that have spoiled the environment and left most local residents destitute, with scant options for jobs or other

means of survival. Young people shoot up from dawn to dark near the jade mines surrounding Hpakant, some 720 kilometers (600 miles) north of

Yangon, Myanmar's biggest city. Addicts, their arms dotted with constellations of needle marks, squat under makeshift tarp shelters or sometimes just shoot up in open daylight. Overdoses are increasingly common, and crime is a growing problem among addicts desperate for drug money.

Committee members say they were attacked by drug dealers in a raid early this year, and now conduct operations only in huge groups of 300 or more, with one or two police officers accompanying them. They say they have also been threatened and harassed by some police who view them as interfering.

Committee members say the woman arrested with the ledger in June is among Hpakant's biggest drug dealers. Naw Lawn said the group also confiscated \$3 million in cash and a "huge amount" of drugs during the arrest. The suspect is awaiting trial.


Financial ties


The financial ties to local officials allegedly revealed in the notebooks tell only part of the story of the Myanmar drug trade's ties to the powerful.

Myanmar trails only Afghanistan in production of opium, the main ingredient in heroin. Its opium poppies are grown mostly in Kachin and Shan states, where the government has long fought rebel groups seeking more autonomy for their respective ethnic groups. Both the military and rebel groups have used the opium trade to further their causes. The Kachin Women's Association of Thailand said in a 2014 report that Myanmar's military uses the drug trade as a weapon of war, authorizing border guards and local militias to grow opium and produce heroin and meth. AP reporters have seen opium farms protected by army-controlled militia groups. The government has attempted to stop opium-growing with eradication programs intended to compel farmers to switch to legal crops, but those efforts have fallen well short of expectations. — AP

KUWAIT: Kuwait Stock Exchange (KSE) ended last week in the green zone. The Price Index closed at 5,780.76 points, up by 0.86 percent from the week before closing, the Weighted Index increased by 0.68 percent after closing at 389.81 points, whereas the KSX-15 Index closed at 929.05 points up by 0.60 percent. STOCKS RETURN TO BLACK AFTER SUMMER SWOON

NEW YORK: Maybe you shouldn't have put your money under a mattress after all. The stock market is back in the black for the year after a bruising late-August tumble that had investors worrying about their money in a way they hadn't in four years.

A three-week surge in stocks has now lifted the Standard & Poor's 500 index above where it was at the beginning of 2015 for the first time since the summer.

The S&P 500 fell 12 percent from its mid-July high to its depths in late August, as investors worried that slowing growth in China, along with continued economic weakness in Europe and Japan, would crush any hopes of stronger global growth. It was the first correction in four years, and it looked like investors in the US stock market could be on track for their first annual losses, including dividends, since 2008. Then central bankers and stronger corporate profits helped turn things around. The world's three biggest economies, the US, China and Europe, moved to push interest rates down or postpone expected rate increases. That gave investors more money to buy stocks and other assets, which in turn pushed up

And what was thought to be a bleak US corporate earnings season started to look a lot brighter in recent days, especially when tech giants Amazon and Google parent company Alphabet posted surprisingly strong profits this week.

"The tone of the market has changed from where we were a week ago or certainly a month ago," said Erik Davidson, chief investment officer for Wells Fargo Private Bank.

While investors could have hoped for fatter returns by this point in 2015, they are now better off than if they had done nothing with their money. Here's a look at how \$10,000 invested back in January in the stock market and in other common investments would have fared.

STOCKS

Investments in the S&P 500 through an index mutual fund or exchange-traded fund are up 2.4 percent for the year, including dividends that companies pay throughout the year. If you had put \$10,000 into the SPDR S&P 500 ETF, your investment would be worth \$10,244 today.

BONDS

Like the stock market, bonds have seesawed throughout the year and are almost unchanged from the end of 2014. An investor who put money into a broad portfolio of bonds measured either by the Barclays Aggregate Bond Index or a bond market fund like the Vanguard Total Bond Market Index Fund would have earned 1.4 percent this year, including interest. Their \$10,000 would have turned into \$10,142.

THE BIG APPLE

Investors have made Apple the world's most valuable company, and they've done pretty nicely in Apple stock in 2015. The company reported blockbuster sales and profits over the last year, thanks to the popularity of its new, larger-screen iPhones.

But investors have fretted over Apple's ability to maintain its prodigious growth, especially amid economic uncertainty in China. Apple shares slumped in August and again in late September, but they spent less time down in the dumps than the S&P 500. If you invested \$10,000 in Apple at the start of this year, you would have \$10,925 now.

FOOL'S GOLD?

Gold is often touted as one of the safest of all investments, because it rises along with inflation and allows investors to retain buying power. So far this year, gold has been nothing but dull. A \$10,000 investment in the largest exchange-traded gold fund would be worth \$9,817 now.

STRATEGIC APPROACHES TO HRM CAN ENHANCE PERFORMANCE

ontemporary business practice has transformed the role of human resource manager as a strategic one owing to the level and scope of contribution that the function adds to the organization through addressing several underlying issues in the organization. Today we look into detail as to how human resource management has evolved as a strategic function in the contemporary businesses taking into account the trend of key challenges appearing to exist in the business environment in line with the unpredictable stakeholders emerging preferences. The different views such as the resource based view, contingency view and the Universalist perspective are critically discussed to support the discussion that human resource management function nowadays contributes effectively when collaborating with strategic management of the organization. Through playing a major role by seeking to enhance performance through effective decision making and proper execution of future strategic directives evolving in the methodology of the 5 year and 10 year preventative planning defined as the 2040 State strategies.

HRM as a strategic function

For a business function to be classified as a strategic one it has to perform two major activities: strategy formulation and strategy execution. Earlier on, human resource management performed the function of staffing whereby only filling jobs. It only looks to forecast vacancies judging from the trends in turnovers, assess employee performances by conducting performance appraisals and developing intervention plans and training & development plans to improve employee performance based on conducting the necessary assessments so as to make sure that the employee performance standards meet those required by the organization. All this constitutes planning and forecasting, decision making and executing, which apply both strategy formulation and execution. Ultimately the case evolved into further influences which began to appear and affect the overall strategy formulation of the organization on a broader view(Boxall,

1998). From a general perspective in terms of the outlook on human resource management as a strategic function, several factors have accounted for the shift in the scope of human resource management in the contemporary business practice. According to Barney (1991), the elements of research, planning, organizing, managing and controlling in human resource management add to the strategic function it performs. The heart of strategic human resource management lies in the "manpower planning" element. This element pertains to the pro-activeness in the approach adopted by the contemporary human resource managers (Monks & McMackin, 2001). An example of this is the forecast of the manpower requirements which is undertaken beforehand and the recruitment accordingly is executed before the actual vacancies arise which result in fewer or no affects upon the overall organizational performance due to turnovers and shortfall in manpower and employees in the company. Human resource management allows the organization to perceive the strengths that lie in terms of manpower and based on that organizations make their observations through a source of competency and structured decision making accordingly. This thus, allows human resource management function to be directly associated with the corporate strategy building and not just in implementation (Desler, 2008).

Another driver of the shift in the scope of human resource management is the technical and research oriented tools and tactics applied in human resource management that aid sin planning, forecasting and monitoring and controlling operations related with recruitment and selection, man power planning, performance management, performance measurement, performance appraisal, etc. (Boxall, 1998). The heavy reliance on the complex and structured systems and tools in the human resource management process that aligns employee performance and requirements with the overall goals and strategy of the organization have resulted in the strategic scope of the business function in the modern business environment (Barney, 2001). Human resource management takes into account the key challenges faced by the organization and

develop framework of understanding to match these challenges with the competencies of employees and manpower and how these can be used, enhanced and managed to generate the effective performance outcomes required to meet those challenges (Kamoche, 1996). Based on this very alignment with the corporate strategy, human resource management shares contribution in development of the competitive strategies of the organization of which manpower competency is a crucial component.

HR professionals

Organizations now make use of specialized human resource departments that have entire teams performing specialized roles related with several activities of human resource management. The function of human resource management has evolved in scope and with the need for a separate department with department heads and supervisory staff together with teams working for separate activities has become crucial for effective performance of the human resource management function (Monks and McMackin, 2001). The function is not just responsible for hiring and recruiting staff but also for the development of strategies and plans regarding the policies, procedures, practices, tools and methods to apply to ensure that the performance targets of the organizations are achieved (Boxall, 1998). From the performance targets of the organizations, the human resource professionals derive strategies and objectives to ensure that those performance targets are acquired through managing number, staffing, hiring, performance, morale and motivation of the employees. The strategic role of human resource management is tied with how it develops plans and strategies that affect the organization's performance in the long run and in a large magnitude and for that an entire department filled with staff is infused in the hierarchy to perform the necessary functions.

HR policies and practices

Human resource managers develop policies and practices to ensure that the organizational targets relating to employee performance that aids in the profitability of the

organization are attained. However, this is a rigorous process but is often the most crucial underpinning the effectiveness of the human resource management function as a strategic one as through policies and practices the function is tied with the corporate strategy of the organization. Each of the policies and practices is linked with the corporate values, vision and strategy (Boxall, 1998).

Employee behaviors and competencies

The major shift in the role of human resource managers was the attention given to managing employee behaviors and influencing and shaping their competencies. This aided in transforming the role of human resource management as a strategic function. This is done primarily to allow organizations to achieve its productivity targets that are tied with each individual employee. The human resource department and management function in particular performs several different activities under long term strategies to manage employee behaviors (Monks & McMackin, 2001). This involves looking after the workplace relationships, work related attitude, job satisfaction, motivation, morale, ethical behavior of each employee, employer-employee relationships, etc. human resource managers apply the use of technical tools such as performance measurement tools, performance appraisal tools, etc. to measure employee performance and asses their job satisfaction and job related attitudes timely to ensure that their behaviors are aligned with the corporate strategy and culture of the organization and identify areas of weaknesses that need rectification and supervision and attention of immediate supervisors and managers (Boxall, 1998). Human resource managers develop recruitment plans, staffing plans, appraisal plans and techniques, training and development plans and compensation plans that all are tied with enhancing employee contributions towards the overall organizational performance. Human resource management allows the organization to know of the strengths that lie in terms of manpower and based on that organizations see this as a source of competency and base decision making regarding other plans on that (Spector, 1985).

GOOGLE OPENS ALPHABET ERA WITH Q3 REPORT THAT LIFTS STOCK

SAN FRANCISCO: Google received an "A" from investors for its third-quarter report that ushered the Internet search leader into a new era under Alphabet, its recently formed parent company. The numbers released Thursday indicated that Google is making significant strides in the increasingly important mobile-device market, with its earnings surging 45 percent to nearly \$4 billion, or \$5.73 per share.

Ruth Porat, Alphabet's chief financial officer, cited improvements in mobile search and more mobile traffic on Google's YouTube video site as keys to the quarter. Alphabet, which replaced Google as a publicly traded stock earlier this month, won extra credit by announcing plans to spend nearly \$5.1 billion buying its own shares over an unspecified period. Buying back stock is something Google never did in its 11-year history as a publicly traded company.

The third-quarter gains also reflected the financial discipline that has been imposed by Porat, who made it clear she intended to curb spending shortly after joining Google in May. Google's operating expenses in the third quarter rose at slightly slower pace than net revenue, helping to fatten profit margins. Google's revenue for the three months ending in September totaled \$18.7 billion. After subtracting ad commissions, revenue totaled \$15.1 billion, a 15 percent increase from last year. Both the third-quarter earnings and revenue topped the analysts' projections that steer investors' expectations. Alphabet's Class C stock soared \$62.86, or 9 percent, to \$744. If the shares hit that level in Friday's regular session, it will be a new high for the stock

The report covered a three-month period ending marked Google's final quarter as a public company. Google now is a subsidiary of Alphabet, which was created to oversee the hodgepodge of businesses that have been launched with the tens of billions of dollars that Google has made as the Internet's dominant search engine.

In January, Alphabet will report Google's financial numbers separately from a group of peripheral businesses that experiment with self-driving cars, invest in startups, make Internet-connected thermostats and search for cures to health problems.

That breakdown is expected to reveal how much money Google would have been making in recent years if it hadn't been diverting billions of dollars to finance risky projects that Alphabet CEO Larry Page calls "moon shots." Page, Google's cofounder, had been the company's CEO until Alphabet's birth. Google's new CEO, Sundar Pichai, assured analysts during a Thursday conference call that the company is "just beginning to scratch the service Our vision is for Google to remain a place of incredible creativity and innovation that uses a unique technical expertise to tackle big problems."

Google's profit margins have been squeezed by the shift to mobile devices from laptop and desktop computers during the past five years. The company was better prepared for the upheaval than most of its technology peers because it had the foresight to build and develop Android, a mobile operating system that features Google's search engine, maps, email and YouTube video site. — AP

DORSEY'S TWITTER STOCK GIFT WELL-TIMED TO STEM BRAIN DRAIN

SAN FRANCISCO: Twitter Chief Executive Jack Dorsey's novel move to give a third of his company stock to an employee equity pool is a smart gesture to restore confidence in a company that lost its way, according to recruiting and compensation experts. Beyond its generosity, the gift is a

strategic effort to retain and attract key talent at the social media company, roiled by months of leadership uncertainty and questions over its long-term growth.

"It's a deliberate and wise and somewhat necessary move to shore up the talent you want to keep," said recruiter Jason Hanold, who places executives and top managers in the technology industry. Twitter co-founder Dorsey, who was named permanent CEO earlier this month, made a surprise announcement late on Thursday that he would give shares worth \$206 million to the company for free, in order to "reinvest directly in our people."

Shares of Twitter, which have fallen 44 percent in the past six months, closed up 3.9 percent on Friday. The move was designed "to instill confidence in investors and employees to show he's trying to do the right thing for the company," said Dan Marcec, director of content and marketing communications at executive compensation data firm Equilar.

A top priority is to keep key employees happy after Twitter announced it would lay off about 8 percent of its staff earlier this month, soon after Dorsey took the job on a permanent basis.

The transfer of 6.8 million shares of common stock is subject to stockholders in 2016 approving an equity incentive plan for the shares to be granted "over time" to Twitter employees. The board has approved the deal. — Reuters

TECH SPATS SPARK FEARS OF 'DIGITAL PROTECTIONISM'

TENSIONS IN EU OVER PRIVACY, ANTITRUST AND OTHER ISSUES

WASHINGTON: As American tech giants extend their global reach, fears are growing on their side of the Atlantic over trade barriers some see as "digital protectionism." While China has long been a difficult market for US firms to navigate, tensions have been rising with the European Union on privacy, antitrust and other issues, impacting tech firms such as Google, Facebook and Uber.

In recent weeks, Europe's highest court struck down an agreement which allowed US firms to transfer personal data out of the region without running afoul of privacy rules.

In parallel, Brussels is looking to create a new "digital single market" simplifying rules for operating across EU borders-but which could also include new regulations for online "platforms".

Some see this as a jab at US retailers like Amazon, "sharing economy" services like Airbnb or even news outfits. Ed Black, president of the Computer and Communications Industry Association, said the platform proposal "has the potential to be troublesome." "Nobody has defined what a platform is," Black told AFP. "It feels like a proposal to solve a non-problem."

After the European Court of Justice invalidated the so-called "Safe Harbor" data-sharing agreement this month, Secretary of Commerce Penny Pritzker said Washington was "deeply disappointed."

For the past 15 years, the key transatlantic accord allowed tech firms like Facebook to operate on both sides of the ocean without running afoul of EU privacy laws. The ruling, Pritzker said, "creates significant uncertainty for both US and EU companies and consumers and puts at risk the thriving transatlantic digital economy."

Undercurrent of fear

"We're waiting to see which way Europe goes," says Daniel Castro, vice president at the Information Technology & Innovation Foundation, a Washington think tank. Castro detects "an undercurrent of fear" in Europe because of the popularity of services such as Google and Facebook but argues that the US and EU "need to be on the same side when it comes to free trade."

Another source of friction is Europe's effort to enforce the "right to be forgotten," allowing individuals to remove online content from searches that are outdated or inaccurate. France has ordered Google to carry this out worldwide, not just in Europe but US firms see this as a form of censorship, effectively enabling people to rewrite history to hide embarrassing data. "You're taking about Europe imposing its

version of how the world should be on everyone else," Castro said.

President Barack Obama expressed concerns about digital trade barriers in an interview earlier this year with Re/code. "We have owned the Internet. Our companies have created it, expanded it, perfected it in ways that (European firms) can't compete," Obama said in response to a question about European actions in the digital sphere.

"And oftentimes what is portrayed as high-minded positions on issues sometimes is just designed to carve out some of their commercial interests."

Buy time for Europe

That view was echoed by Kati Suominen, who heads the Future of Trade initiative for the Center for

Strategic and International Studies, a think tank. Europe sees it is lagging and is moving on policies in order "to buy time," she argued. "Europe is seeking to build its own digital economy by complicating the operations of foreign companies on European soil. In that sense, it is protectionism," she said.

Rather than throw up new barriers, she argued, Europe should be tearing them if it wishes to foster a digital economy-notably to enable better access to venture capital. Last month Guenther Oettinger, the EU commissioner for the digital economy and society, brushed aside suggestions of protectionism. "Our rules on a European level are relevant for everybody, for European producers and players, for Asian players, and for American players as well," he said during a visit to San Francisco. — AFP

EX-RABOBANK TRADERS TO TESTIFY IN LIBOR TRIAL

NEW YORK: Two former Rabobank traders from Britain facing US charges that they engaged in a scheme to manipulate Libor interest rates plan to testify in their own defense, their lawyers said on Friday. Their disclosure came as prosecutors said they were prepared to rest by Monday in presenting their case in Manhattan federal court against the two traders on trial, Anthony Allen and Anthony Conti. The traders are the first to face trial in the United States following a global investigation into whether various banks submitted artificial rate estimates to bolster

profits on trading derivatives tied to Libor.

Allen, Rabobank's former global head of liquidity and finance, and Conti, a senior trader, were indicted in October 2014, a year after the Netherlands-based bank reached a \$1 billion deal resolving related US and European probes. Both have pleaded not guilty to charges including conspiracy and wire fraud over alleged roles to help manipulate US dollar and yen Libor rates to benefit the Netherlands-based bank's trading positions. Michael Schachter, Allen's lawyer, told US District Judge Jed Rakoff that after prosecutors rest, the defense would call expert witnesses and that they intended to call Allen.

Aaron Williamson, Conti's lawyer, confirmed in a brief interview that his client also planned to testify. Schachter said Allen, a British citizen, would testify to

how he voluntarily waived extradition in March to fight the charges.

"We believe that shows consciousness of innocence," Schachter said. He contrasted his client's decision with two other overseas ex-Rabobank traders who, like Allen and Conti, were charged by the US Justice Department but have not appeared in US court.

Judge Rakoff responded that one of them, Paul Thompson, had been arrested. Earlier on Friday, Bloomberg reported that Thomspson had been arrested in Australia. Justice Department spokesman Peter Carr referred questions to Australian authorities. Australian authorities had no immediate comment, and Thompson's lawyer did not respond to requests for comment.

requests for comment.

Libor, or the London interbank offered rate, is a short-term rate banks charge each other for loans that is calculated based on submissions by a panel of banks. It underpins hundreds of trillions of dollars in financial products globally. The case is the first by the Justice Department to go to trial following investigations by US and European authorities.

Those investigations resulted in charges against 22 people in the United States and United Kingdom and around \$9 billion in regulatory settlements with financial institutions. — Reuters

Clearance has been set between the engine hood front edge and the hood lock striker to achieve a structure that easily deforms upon impact with the aim of ensuring pedestrian protection performance.

The 2016 Land Cruiser has a total of ten airbags. For the first time, both driver and front seat passenger have knee airbag protection and both front airbags have a two-stage inflation capability to match the severity of the collision impact. Side airbags are standard on the front and second row seats, and curtain shield airbags protect outer seat passengers in all three rows.

Active headrests on the driver and front passenger seats move up and forward almost instantly in the event of rear-end collisions to help reduce the distance between the occupant's head and the headrest. The advanced seatbelt system is designed to retract the front seatbelts when the brakes are suddenly applied.

A Blind Spot Monitor (BSM) System is also available which alerts the driver of other vehicles located at their side to assist the driver. By getting information from the radar sensor, the Blind Spot Monitor System is able to alert the driver of vehicles located in a blind spot. When another vehicle is detected in the blind spot, and also the turn signal lamp switch is not operated, one of the indicators mounted on the outer mirror surfaces turns on. The Rear View Monitor System displays video images of objects behind thevehicle in order to help the visibility of the driver when

backing up. There is also a Clearance and Back Sonar System which helps assist the driver in detecting the presence of obstacles when maneuvering the vehicle in tight areas and/or when parking the vehicle.

The Land Cruiser's new advanced safety technology package called Toyota Safety Sense includes items that are particularly effective in reducing risk of accidents. These include the following:

- Pre-Crash Safety system (PCS) that uses sensors to detect other vehicles or obstructions and warms the driver to perform evasive maneuvers while automatically activating the brakes when there is a high probability of a collision Radar Cruise Control helps maintain a suitable vehicle-to-vehicle distance while following the preceding vehicle.
- Lane Departure Alert (LDA) system warns the driver when the vehicle is unintentionally deviating from its lane.
- Automatic High Beam (AHB) System detects oncoming headlamps and/or tail lamps of preceding vehicles and automatically switches to low beam to reduce glare.





BIG-GAME HUNTING TENSIONS REKINDLED WITH BEAR HUNT

TAMPA/ORLANDO: Florida's first bear hunt in two decades opens, joining other states that have loosened restrictions on hunting large predators, to the dismay of animal rights activists who see them as "trophy hunts." The hunt, which will span up to one week and allow up to 320 black bears to be killed, aims to stabilize a population that has rebounded to more than 3,000 from several hundred in the 1970s, according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

Hunting enthusiasts have defended such hunts in Florida and elsewhere as necessary to manage expanding numbers of bears and other large animals that threaten humans, while animal rights activists have decried the trend as cruel and ineffective.

"There has been a need to make seasons longer, make them more liberal, because there have been so many predators and they're not as controlled as they should be," said Nick Pinizzotto, president and chief executive officer of the Sportsmen's Alliance. The hunt comes at a time when several western states are considering regulations that would make it easier to hunt cougars. The big cats, with an historical range that stretched from coast to coast, have staged a comeback in recent years in some parts of the country.

Policies recently enacted or are under review in New Mexico, Oregon and Utah could result in the killing of more cougars, also known as mountain lions or panthers. "The trend is 'let's open a trophy hunt," said Tracy Coppola, director of the wildlife abuse campaign at the Humane Society of the United States, referring to decisions largely being made by state wildlife managers. "It's a very wrong management technique."

Statewide protests

In Florida, hunt opponents held statewide protests on Friday, aiming to build on the international outrage generated this summer by the killing of Cecil, a rare black-maned lion, by an American dentist who was on an African hunting trip. The controversy comes as suburban development further encroaches on to the habitat of bears, cougars and other large predators, increasing the likelihood of contact with

"We revere them, and we name our football teams after them," noted Gavin Shire, a spokesman for the US Fish and Wildlife Service. "And yet we also fear them, because of the potential harm that they can do, and the protections around them." That was the case in Florida, where state wildlife officers have received increasing complaints about bears in neighborhoods close to woodlands

where the animals have long roamed. Open garbage cans and unattended backyard grills attract bears looking for an easy meal. Hunt opponents say programs to eliminate such food sources could reduce conflicts between bears and humans more effectively than hunting. At least four Floridians have been injured in bear attacks in the past two years, mostly in the suburbs north of Orlando.

In the Northeast, New Jersey expanded its bear hunting season for 2015, a year after a hiker was killed by a black bear, the first fatal attack in the state in recorded history. Across the states mulling greater hunting, the scope of the expansion varies widely. Oregon is considering a zone approach to expand the cougar hunting that is already allowed, for example, while New Mexico has approved more trapping on private as well as state trust lands, according to the Humane Society.

Not all plans are advancing. On Friday, the Humane Society cheered a decision in Colorado to hold off on a plan to expand mountain lion hunting there. Washington's governor earlier this week blocked a decision by state wildlife managers to expand cougar hunting in the Pacific Northwest state, citing concerns about transparency during the rule-making process. —Reuters

HOSPITAL OFFERS RARE HOPE FOR SUDAN BREAST CANCER PATIENTS

The sole hospital in country of 30 million

KHARTOUM: Local doctors told Aida Abdulla her chest pain was an infection, arthritis or muscle strain. But when she travelled to a hospital in Khartoum months later she was diagnosed with breast cancer. It had also spread to her liver. Now she is preparing for surgery at the Khartoum Breast Care Centre (KBCC), the only specialized hospital in Sudan, a country of more than 30 million.

"My whole family was upset. Everyone was worried because we have never seen this illness before," said the 49-year-old, dressed in purple and orange robes in a spotless clinic at the KBCC. A lack of awareness about the disease and few screening facilities mean that, like Abdulla, who comes from a farming family in White Nile state bordering war-torn South Sudan, many Sudanese women are diagnosed when the cancer is advanced.

She is one of a growing number to seek treatment at the KBCC, a private, not-for-profit hospital founded by Sudanese radiologist Dr Hania Fadl. Problems like those faced by Abdulla persuaded Fadl to return to her home country after nearly three decades working as a radiologist on breast cancer screening in London.

"During visits to Sudan, I noticed an increase in the number of women affected by the illness and a lack of proper opportunities for diagnosis and treatment," she said with a hint of an English accent picked up during her years abroad. She was lucky to have both knowhow and finances. The charitable foundation run by her ex-husband, the Sudanese-British businessman Mo Ibrahim, gave the \$14 million (12.3 million Euros) needed to complete it.

"It was a real struggle. It took a lot of perseverance and a lot of money," the diminutive 68-year-old said, sitting in her office in the reflective blue glass tower that houses the centre, the product of five years' toil. Ignoring financial advisers' warnings to abandon the project, Fadl pressed on, buying a digital mammogram machine for screening and two anesthetic machines, and eventually opening

the KBCC in October 2010.

Region-wide problem

The centre dominates her life-she lives in an apartment above the spotless corridors of the centre, where women dressed in colorful traditional robes move anxiously from room to room, for mammograms, biopsies and surgery. Fadl is taking a break to visit London to collect an OBE for services to women's healthcare on October 27, but she is still planning ahead. She wants patients who can afford the treatment to pay and cover the costs of those who cannot, like Abdulla.

The KBCC covered the costs of her chemotherapy and will pay for 80 percent of her surgery fees. In a clinic decorated with pink ribbons for breast cancer awareness month, Abdulla was exhausted from her chemotherapy four months ago-but grateful. The \$50 the centre charges for a digital mammogram is still too expensive for many, but 40 percent of the major surgeries they carried out were paid for.

Fadl has heard-the health ministry does not keep full records of breast cancer statistics-that of nearly 2,000 women diagnosed in Sudan every year, about 60 percent die due to lack of proper care. The problem is a major one not just in Sudan, but in many developing countries, where there are few resources for screening and education. Women have travelled from South Sudan, Chad and Ethiopia for treatment at the KBCC. "Mosttwo-thirds of-deaths from breast cancer and almost nine in 10 women who die from cervical cancer live in low- and middle-income countries," said Ophira Ginsburg, a World Health Organization breast cancer specialist.

'Catching cases early'

Even with her state-of-the-art equipment and her new staff, working in Sudan poses unique challenges. The country has been under a trade embargo by the United States since 1997, imposed over rights abuses and President Omar Al-Bashir's support for radical militant groups. When the digital mammogram machine, bought from a US company, broke down in April, it took 10 weeks to get the permits to allow an engineer to come with

spare parts to repair it. "We have ladies from South Sudan, from Darfur who come through hell to reach here," she said. Unsure of when the machine would be fixed, many had to be told to go back and return later. But the centre has also had successes. Samrin Farouk Habbani, a 28-year-old doctor at the centre since 2013, has seen a change in the cases they receive

When she arrived, many patients were advanced, but unlike Abdulla, were inoperable. They were some of the hardest times of Habbani's career. "But we have started getting cases in the early stages and people have a better understanding of screening," she said. —AFP

GIRL WITH SERVICE DOG WANTS SUPREME COURT TO TAKE CASE

DETROIT: The US Supreme Court is being asked to take an appeal from an 11-year-old Michigan girl with cerebral palsy who switched schools after her service dog wasn't welcomed in a district in Jackson County.

It's a long shot; the Supreme Court rejects thousands of cases each year. But the American Civil Liberties Union believes it's ripe for review because federal appeals courts have given different interpretations to laws protecting the rights of children with disabilities. "To force a child to choose to between her independence and her education is not only illegal - it is heartless," said Michael Steinberg, legal director at the ACLU in Michigan.

In 2009, with support from families in the Napoleon area, Ehlena Fry's family obtained a service dog to help her open doors, retrieve items and use the bathroom. She was 5 at the time and suffered from mobility problems due to cerebral palsy, which affects the brain. But the Napoleon district that fall refused to allow Wonder to accompany Ehlena at school, 75 miles southwest of Detroit. Officials relented somewhat by spring 2010, but many restrictions were placed on Wonder in the classroom. Ehlena was subsequently home-schooled.

The US Education Department in 2012

said the girl's rights had been violated. The school district agreed to let Ehlena return with Wonder, but her parents, fearing difficulties, instead sent her to the Manchester district, which had no problem with the dog. The Frys sued Napoleon, saying the district violated federal disabilities laws when it had refused to accommodate Wonder over a 2 1/2-year period. The case was dismissed on very technical grounds: A judge said the Frys first had to exhaust a series of administrative hearings. An appeals court agreed, 2-1.

That's the issue at the Supreme Court. The ACLU wants the justices to declare that a quick, clear route to a courthouse is available. The petition was filed Oct 15. "It's important to set a precedent so other children's lives are not disrupted while school officials drag their feet and refuse to provide them their right to a service dog or other accommodation," Ehlena's mother, Stacy Fry, said Friday. But an attorney for the Napoleon district, Tim Mullins, said the hearing process works well because families and schools can negotiate an education plan. "I doubt very much the Supreme Court is going to say, 'Yeah, let's pick this up," Mullins said. Ehlena's independence has improved and she now attends school without Wonder. —AP

STATES RELIANT ON FOSSIL FUELS SUE OVER NEW CLEAN AIR RULES

WASHINGTON: States and industry groups dependent on fossil fuels filed court challenges Friday to President Barack Obama's Clean Power Plan, which aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Opponents of the plan filed a flurry of lawsuits at the US Court of Appeals as the Environmental Protection Agency published its final version of the new regulations.

The challenges from all but two of the 25 states were filed by Republicans. They deride the plan as an "unlawful power grab by Washington bureaucrats" that will kill coal mining jobs and drive up electricity costs. "The Clean Power Plan is one of the most far-reaching energy regulations in this nation's history," said West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey, among those leading the challenges. "I have a responsibility to protect the lives of millions of working families, the elderly and the poor, from such illegal and unconscionable federal government actions."

The Obama administration and environmental groups counter that the rules are needed to cut carbon emissions while curbing the worst impacts of climate change and sea-level rise. They also say the plan will spur new clean-energy jobs. The new rules require states to cut carbon emissions by 30 percent by 2030. Each state has a customized target and is responsible for drawing up an effective plan to meet its goal.

"We are confident we will again prevail against these challenges and will be able to work with states to successfully implement these first-ever national standards to limit carbon pollution, the largest source of carbon emissions in the United States," said EPA Administrator Gina McCarthy. The EPA says it has authority to enact the plan under the Clean Air Act. At issue are dueling provisions added to the law by the House and Senate in 1990. The EPA's interpretation relies on the Senate language, but opponents argue that the House version should win out.

'Double regulation'

EPA already regulates other power-plant pollutants under a different section of the Clean Air Act, and the opponents claim the law prohibits "double regulation." Under the act, certain challenges to agency rules skip the federal district court and go directly to the appeals court in Washington, DC. Morrisey also filed a stay barring the plan from taking effect while the court challenges proceed, a question that will likely be up to the Supreme Court.

"We expect polluters and their allies to throw everything they've got at the Clean Power Plan, and we expect them to fail," said Sierra Club Executive Director Michael Brune, among those defending the law. "The Clean Power Plan is based on a law passed by Congress, upheld by the Supreme Court, and demanded by the American people."The states challenging the plan in court are Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Jersey, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, West Virginia, Wyoming and Wisconsin. Also filing suit against the EPA on Friday was Murray Energy Corp, the nation's largest privately owned coal company.

Members of Congress from coal-mining states joined in, saying they will introduce new legislation aimed at blocking the EPA from enforcing the plan. On the other side, 15 states and the District of Columbia say they are backing the Obama administration and will begin working to comply with the new rules.

There is some political variation in the positions taken within the states. In North Carolina, for example, the environmental agency controlled by the Republican governor joined the opposition without the participation of the state's Democratic attorney general. Governors in Colorado, Michigan and New Mexico said they will work to comply with the new EPA rules, even as attorneys general from their states joined the lawsuit. —AP

Drug Maker Offers \$1 rival to \$750 pill that caused outrage

WASHINGTON: A California specialty drug active ingredient is also pyrimethamine. The maker is offering a \$1 rival to a prescription drug solely supplied by Turing Pharmaceuticals, whose 5,000 percent price hike last month sparked outrage in the United States.

Imprimis Pharmaceuticals said Thursday it is offering a combination of pyrimethamine and leucovorin in an oral capsule for physicians to prescribe as a low-cost alternative to Turing's Daraprim, which fights a parasitic infection. The San Diego-based Imprimis said it would offer its alternative capsule starting as low as \$99.00 for a 100-count bottle, a tick less than

Pyrimethamine is used to fight toxoplasmosis, an parasite-borne infection that often inflicts persons with weakened immune systems, such as patients with HIV/AIDS. Leucovorin helps to reverse the negative effects pyrimethamine use on bone marrow. The company will put together a custom com-

six-decade-old drug is the only one approved by the US Federal Drug Administration for the treatment of toxoplasmosis.

Hiking prices

Turing, a privately held biopharmaceutical company, acquired the exclusive rights to market Daraprim in the US in August from Impax Laboratories. In September, Turing hiked the price of the drug from \$13.50 per tablet to \$750 overnight. The move hit a public nerve as Turing's founder and chief executive Martin Shkreli, a 32-year hedge fund manager, made headlines as the "most hated man in America" after a video went viral of him flippantly explaining why he raised the cost of the pill.

The outcry renewed the prolonged debate over soaring drug prices in the US, which unlike other nations, particularly in Europe, has no regulations to keep costs low. "While we pound of the two ingredients. Daraprim's respect Turing's right to charge patients and

insurance companies whatever it believes is appropriate, there may be more cost-effective compounded options for medications, such as Daraprim, for patients, physicians, insurance companies and pharmacy benefit managers to consider," said Mark Baum, chief executive of Imprimis, in a statement.

'This is not the first time a sole-supply generic drug-especially one that has been approved for use as long as Daraprim-has had its price increased suddenly and to a level that may make it unaffordable," he said. Imprimis will launch a new program called Imprimis Cares to make generic drugs available at accessible prices, "in response to this recent case and others that we will soon identify," Baum said.

Turing's Shkreli said, amid the public anger over the Daraprim hike, that the company would lower its price, but in response to an AFP query Friday, it did not say what the new price would be. Shares in Imprimis surged 17.4 percent, closing at \$7.01 on the Nasdaq. —AFP

FDA WARNS OF LIVER DAMAGE WITH ABBVIE HEPATITIS DRUGS

washington: Federal health officials are warning doctors and patients that two hepatitis C drugs from AbbVie can cause life-threatening liver injury in patients with advanced forms of the disease. The Food and Drug Administration said Thursday it will require AbbVie to add new warnings to Viekira Pak and Technivie after reported deaths and liver transplants in patients who already had liver damage caused by hepatitis C.

The warning could reshape the growing field of high-priced drugs to treat the virus, which also includes Gilead Sciences' blockbuster medications Sovaldi and Harvoni. Jefferies analyst Brian Abrahams wrote in an investment note that the warning is a "moderate positive" for Gilead Sciences. But he added that AbbVie's Viekira Pak was already expected to be "displaced" by a similar drug from Merck & Co Inc next year. Bernstein analyst Tim Anderson noted that's AbbVie's drug requires patients to take four to six pills per day. That compares negatively with the once-per-day regimen for Gilead's Harvoni and Merck's upcoming pill, which is slated for approval in early 2016.

"In the ultra-competitive hep C market, this is likely a damaging event," Anderson wrote in an investment note. Shares of North Chicago, Illinois-based AbbVie Inc. plummeted \$5.56, or 10 percent, to close at \$48.27 in trading Thursday. Nearly 3 million Americans have the virus, which develops slowly over decades and, if left untreated, can cause liver failure and liver cancer, requiring transplant.

The FDA said in an online posting that AbbVie's drugs have been linked to multiple cases of severe liver damage - some of them fatal - in patients who already had liver cirrhosis, irreversible scarring of the organ. The agency determined 26 such events were likely related to the drugs, with the liver damage usually occurring


within four weeks of starting treatment.

Side effects

AbbVie said in a statement it is adding a warning to the drugs that they must not be used in patients with moderate to severe liver impairment. "Patient safety is of the utmost concern to AbbVie," the company said in an emailed statement. AbbVie's drugs are part of a new wave of pill-only combinations that cure more patients and cause fewer side effects than older hepatitis C treatments, which required injections and caused flu-like side effects.

Viekira Pak treats the most common form of hepatitis C, known as genotype 1, which accounts for about 75 percent of all US cases. Technivie, approved in July, treats one of the least common forms of hepatitis C. Gilead Sciences initially dominated the space, raking in over \$9.4 billion in sales for Sovaldi in its first full-year on the market. The company followed that approval with the launch of a combination pill, Harvoni, to treat a much broader group of hepatitis C patients.

While doctors and patients have embraced the new drugs, insurers have pushed back over their sky-high prices generally \$83,000 or more for one course of treatment. The launch of AbbVie's pill, Viekira Pak, was welcomed as a muchneeded competitor in the field. Since then, providers have been forcing Gilead and AbbVie to compete on price to get preferred standing in their formularies of approved drugs, and have been winning substantial discounts. Express Scripts, the nation's largest provider of pharmacy benefits, has thrown its weight behind AbbVie's drugs, refusing to cover competing products from Gilead and Johnson & Johnson. Shares of Foster City, Californiabased Gilead Sciences Inc. rose \$5.87, or 5.8 percent, to close at \$107.60. —AP

CLIMATE PACT: THE BUMPY ROAD TO PARIS AND BEYOND

BONN: Diplomats crafting a global pact to defuse climate change are under no illusion that the quest will end in Paris in December. If anything, the latest haggle to prepare for the vaunted UN summit, now just weeks away, has strengthened awareness that reining in carbon emissions is a very long-term problem indeed.

The key, say negotiators, is to enshrine measures in the accord so that, for many years to come, nations will be obliged to do more. In climate jargon, it's called a ratcheting-up mechanism. "This process is not going to finish in Paris," Cuba's negotiator Pedro Luis Pedroso told AFP at this week's five-day parlay in Bonn ahead of the November 30-December 11 climate summit

"Paris will just be an extremely important stopover because it will give a signal to the future." There is little doubt that the summit will come up with some sort of deal. But will it be an empty shell? Or will it provide an ambitious roadmap for achieving the UN goal of limiting warming to two degrees Celsius over pre-industrial levels? The planet has already warmed by 0.8 Cleaving very little room for day/dling.

leaving very little room for dawdling.

"What will really benefit the world's vulnerable communities is a global agreement which includes a ratchet mechanism to increase ambition and ensure we don't lock in a long period of inaction," said climate analyst Mohamed Adow of Christian Aidwhich pushes poor nation agendas. "It is probably the most important issue to be

included in the Paris deal. Without a ratchet mechanism, the Paris deal will be like building a beautiful car with no engine."

Almost everyone agrees on the need to periodically review pledges and ramp them up until the 2 C goal comes into view. But here's where they differ: Should the first review be before 2020 or thereafter? Who will conduct these stock-takes? How often? And will nations be obliged to promise ever-higher targets?

Analysts say emissions-curbing pledges from more than 150 nations so far, set the stage for a 3 C warmer world of potentially dangerous storms, drought, sea-level rise and disease spread. The pledges, called Intended Nationally Determined Contributions or INDCs, will be a cornerstone of the Paris pact, due to enter into force in 2020. Some nations have set fiveyear targets for 2025, others look longerterm to 2030.

"The climate pledges made so far are insufficient and it is therefore essential to have a mechanism for ratcheting up those pledges every five years," said Martin Kaiser of Greenpeace. "They cannot be allowed to stand as they are for the next 10 to 15 years. That is a recipe for further destruction and human misery."

Show us the money

Part of the problem is fear of failurenegotiators are keen to avoid a repeat of the 2009 UN climate conference in Copenhagen which didn't even come close to sealing a global deal. Instead of a topdown approach of apportioning emissions targets, it opened the way to a bottom-up approach: nations would set their own emissions-cutting targets and timelines.

The resulting effort is for now insufficient, but the window for improvement remains open-if only slightly. The UN's climate science panel says greenhouse gas emissions have to drop 40-70 percent between 2010 and 2050, and to zero by 2100. But the same issues holding up progress in drafting the first truly global climate agreement also split nations on the review mechanism.

Developing nations want to make it conditional on rich countries providing hundreds of billions of dollars to help them switch from fossil fuels to renewable energy to power growing populations and economies.

"It will be very much dependent on how the international community devises means and ways to give those less advantaged the capability and the possibility to move forward without compromising on their development needs, without compromising on the need to eradicate poverty," said Pedroso. Many hope the battle lines will fade as new low-carbon technologies are developed, and costs come down. "This is about a process," UN climate chief Christiana Figueres said this week as negotiators bickered in Bonn. "This is not about getting to the two degrees on the 12th of December, 2015."—AFP

CALIFORNIA'S REWARD FOR WATER CONSERVATION IS HIGHER BILLS SACRAMENTO: Their lawns dry and their menting a temporary increase Guglielmo

sacramento: Their lawns dry and their trees on the verge of dying, Californians have dramatically cut water use during the state's relentless drought, only to learn that many local utilities are hiking rates to make up for the lost revenue. Water providers in Los Angeles, the San Francisco Bay Area and other parts of the state have recently told customers that rates will go up at least temporarily, as utilities struggle to pay for building and repairing pipes, buying water and other costs, even as customers cut back.

"Droughts are costly for water agencies," said Lisa Lien Mager, spokeswoman for the Association of California Water Agencies. "Revenues are being affected by the mandatory conservation but at the same time costs are going up." California is in the fourth year of a punishing drought that has led farmers to fallow a half-million acres (202,343 hectares) for each of the past two years, and led Democratic Governor Jerry Brown to order mandatory 25-percent cutbacks in statewide water use.

In Los Angeles, conservation led to a \$111 million drop in revenues during the fiscal year that ended July 1, a period mostly before the mandatory cutbacks kicked into high gear, Department of Water and Power budget director Neil Guglielmo said Friday. The city is imple-

says will add about \$2 per month to customers' bills, while recouping about half of the losses.

Other agencies implementing or considering drought-related water rate hikes include the Contra Costa Water District, the East Bay Municipal Utility District and the San Diego Public Utilities Department. In Contra Costa County, a suburban area east of San Francisco, utility managers implemented a drought surcharge of 50 cents for every 748 gallons (2,830 liters) used, said spokeswoman Jennifer Allen. As a result, the bimonthly bill for a customer using 300 gallons (1,135 liters) per day - a 25 percent cutback over the county's typical use when the drought began - would be \$133, about \$12 more than it would have been without the surcharge.

Max Gomberg, senior environmental scientist for the State Water Resources Control Board, said that many utilities, including those serving the Southern California communities of Irvine and Riverside, had planned ahead for the drought and did not have to raise rates. The others, he said, should expect some consumer backlash. "From the customer's perspective, it's 'I'm conserving and now you're charging me more," Gomberg said. —Reuters

Film Review



'Paranormal Activity: The Ghost Dimension'

o this is the way a franchise ends. The sixth and allegedly final installment of the massively money-minting found-footage horror series, "Paranormal Activity: The Ghost Dimension" offers little more than a distant, whimpering echo of a film property that once made such a bang. Distinguished mostly by the addition of 3D and an unusual distribution window, the film is scheduled to hit VOD less than three weeks after leaving cinemas, to the chagrin of a few theater chains. It will be interesting to see if the experimental release strategy pays off in the long run, and it's not hard to imagine the "Paranormal" series living on thanks to the multiplicity of new digital content platforms. For all the memorable scares it manages to cook up, "The Ghost Dimension" might have actually worked better as a series of GIFs.

Though it hardly invented the found-footage conceit, the original "Paranormal Activity" certainly helped elevate it to the status of a proper and profitable subgenre, with its own unique tropes and cinematic language. Subsequent sequels might have diminished its legacy a bit-though last year's oftmaligned Latino-themed offshoot, "The Marked Ones," was refreshingly unserious-yet nothing compares to the feature-length shrug that director Gregory Plotkin offers this time around. There may well be new and novel ways to spark audience shivers from not-so-bright homeowners inexplicably using their cameraphones to check out bumps in the night, but this series clearly has neither the patience nor the inclination to look for them anymore.

While it does answer some lingering questions about the franchise's overarching mythology, "The Ghost Dimension" spends most of its running time dully retracing old steps, introducing yet another suburban family-father Ryan Fleege (Chris J Murray), mother Emily Fleege (Brit Shaw), and 7-year-old daughter Leila (Ivy George) — as they prepare for Christmas in their enormous new Santa Rosa house. Joining them for a few weeks is Ryan's brother Mike (Dan Gill), a commodiously mustached hipster recovering from a breakup, and Skylar (Olivia Taylor Dudley), a young blonde woman of unclear relation to the family, in town for some sort of yoga retreat that allows her to abruptly disappear from the film for long stretches.

Paint-by-numbers

Like all "Paranormal" subjects, the Fleeges are chronic videographers, and Ryan gets to flex some new photographic muscles when he finds a old-school camcorder stashed in the garage, along with a collection of old family videos. In addition to looking charmingly retro, the camera also picks up a strange number of odd vibrations and apparitions around the house that are invisible to the naked eye, as well as more modern devices. (Not only are these Ghost-o-Vision sequences the film's most creative, they also provide it with its only non-financial reason to employ 3D.)

At first, the camera only shows Rorschach-like blobs of debris floating through the air, but it's not long before everything starts to go haywire. Young Leila develops a sudden allergy to Christian iconography and begins talking to an imaginary friend named Toby; Ryan and Mike pop in the old home movies only to discover footage of a strange cult with two telepathic children; and since even malevolent demons have a soft spot for vintage arcade games, the pinball machine starts turning on by itself

A certain degree of character stupidity is to be expected in a paint-by-numbers horror pic, so of course Ryan progresses through his collection of Sinister Mystery Videos That Might Explain Everything at a seeming rate of one per day, and of course the family lets Leila continue to sleep alone in her room even after she draws pagan symbols on her wall and icily intones, "He's going to take me away ... " But at times the film's multiple scripters almost seem to forget what has transpired in the scene previous: Characters can observe multiple instances of supernatural activity one night, then immediately revert into "It's probably just a coincidence!"-skeptics the next morning.

Without much spark to the jump scares, the film turns to hoary exorcism tropes and CGI fantasias in the later going, undoing much of the low-key believability that was essential to "Paranormal's" appeal in the first place. Youngster George makes for a very effective creepy kid when called upon, though her adult counterparts fail to leave much of an impression. The below-the-line crew doesn't have a whole lot to work with, considering the film never once leaves the family's property, yet the environs are as bland as can be, and one would have to trawl through the deepest recesses of Romanian art cinema to find a film with as many static, silent shots of empty rooms and unfurnished hallways. — Reuters

Middle-Earth Map annotated by Tolkien discovered

map of Middle-Earth annotated by JRR Tolkien has been discovered in a copy of "The Lord of the Rings" owned by illustrator Pauline Baynes. The document offers glimpses into many of Tolkien's observations on the fictional world, which hosts the action in "The Lord of the Rings" and "The Hobbit" (and their subsequent film adaptations). To name a few, he notes that Hobbiton is on the same latitude as Oxford, England, and hints that the Italian city of Ravenna could be the inspiration behind the city of Minas Tirith.

The map is on display and up for sale at Blackwell's Rare Books for 60,000\$. Blackwell's says the map shows "the exact nature" of Tolkien's vision. "Before going on display in the shop this week, this had only ever been in private hands," Henry Gott, modern first editions specialist at Blackwell's, said. "One of the points of interest is how much of a hand Tolkien had in the poster map; all of his suggestions, and there are many, are reflected in Baynes' version. The degree to which it is properly collaborative was not previously apparent, and couldn't be without a document like this. Its importance is mostly to do with the insight it gives into that process."

The map also shows the novelist using Belgrade, Cyprus and Jerusalem as reference points for the created world. "The map shows how completely obsessed he was with the details. Anyone else interfered at their peril," said Sian Wainwright at Blackwell's. "He was tricky to work with, but very rewarding in the end." — Reuters

Batman v Superman' plot details revealed

enry Cavill has spilled the beans on why his character, Superman, is at war with Ben Affleck's Batman in "Batman v Superman: Dawn of Justice." Cavill, in an interview with Total Film, has revealed the dynamics of the conflict-which has been hinted at in the trailers for the movie, in which Batman's alter ego Bruce Wayne is attempting to escape the destruction of Metropolis. The British actor explains that the movie contains an entire "prologue" in the sequence, which includes the destruction of the Wayne Financial Building.

"What happens there is one of Bruce's buildings gets destroyed and he's trying to save all the people inside the building and he can't," Cavill said. "So he is this angry person who fears what Superman may do. Why are they just going to trust this super-powered alien? What if he does decide to turn against us?" Warner Bros

will release the film on March 25. For his part, Affleck elaborated on why his Batman has gone after Superman.

"He's found himself in a place of harboring a tremendous amount of rage for Superman," Affleck said. "So it's how he got there, and what that's done to him, and what that's done to people around him like Alfred, who are, I think, very scared and worried for him. It's something that's interesting and new." Affleck also commented on the possibility of directing a solo Batman movie-a scenario that emerged in July — after writing the script with Geoff Johns.

"If I could make it work, yeah, obviously that would be like a dream," he told the magazine. "The trick is, as to any movie, is to make sure that you - if you're going to direct it - that you can make it good. You've got to have the right idea and the right take on it... Broadly speaking,

ROSY, AIRY AND SHINY: THREE TAKEAWAYS FROM SAO PAULO FASHION WEEK

here Sao Paulo Fashion Week goes, much of Latin America follows, and this year the message from the catwalks is to look rosy and airy-while throwing in a metallic glint. Although a younger sister to the New York, Paris, London and Milan versions, Sao Paulo Fashion Week is the biggest on the continent and part of a growing southern hemisphere fashion scene.

That Brazil's supermodel Gisele Bundchen chose the Sao Paulo catwalk for her retirement in April didn't hurt its credibility either. SPFW, which closed Friday, featured winter 2016 collections from more than 30 designers, including local favorites such as Ronaldo Fraga, Reinaldo Lourenco, Fernanda Yamamoto, Joao Pimenta and Vitorino Campos. And as the fashionistas pack their bags, here are three takeaways:

Rose-tinted

Fraga, Campos and Animale seem to be wearing the same glasses: rose-tinted. Pink in different shades found its way into coats and trousers, with Animale combining a pale version with hot yellow. "I saw a lot of pink, but you have to be careful. It's a difficult color and you have to take care in how you use it so that it doesn't become childish," Brazilian fashion guru Gloria Kalil told AFP. White was also widely used, adding to the light touch.

Winter, what winter?

Brazilian winters are a relative concept, so this collection was never going to come fur-lined.

Instead the well-dressed Latin American is looking for airy, easily adaptable clothing to cope with those slight dips in the thermometer. "We can use these lighter and more delicate clothes with lace and perforations," Kalil said. That suits Yamamoto, who goes several times a year to Paraiba in remote northeastern Brazil to visit women making traditional lace, then adding contemporary twists. "The lace creates a different texture, it's part of the tendency toward using feathers and rope in an artisanal style," Brazilian style consultant Camila Toledo said. The southern winter will also see plenty of ankles on show, with designers favoring wide flared trousers rising several centimeters higher than standard.

Living Metal

There's a harder edge coming too. Flower and animal prints have gone with the summer. Stripes and geometric shapes are in, especially in black and white, with collections from Lourenco and the lodice label being typical examples. The metallic look also caught the eye this year. The always-popular silver was less in evidence, with copper on the rise, shining against a general backdrop of grey and skin-tones. Boots by Gloria Coelho had a coppery sheen, while the Lolitta collection made widespread use of combined silver and copper. "Metals are beautiful and still used a lot," Kalil said. — AFP

Major retrospective brings Balthus back to Rome

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Balthus is the subject of a major retrospective opening this weekend in Rome, two years after a similar exhibition in New York sparked controversy over the French painter's erotically-charged depictions of barely pubescent girls. Nearly



15 years after his death, the collection of some 150 of his works represents a return to a city where Balthus spent a considerable chunk of his career, and to a country that inspired a passion for figurative painting that placed him outside the major modernist art movements of the 20th Century

Balthus, born Balthazar Klossowski de Rola to a France-based Polish father and Russian mother, was director of the French Academy in Rome from 196177 and was largely responsible for the restoration and reorganization of its home, the Villa Medici. Still one of the city's landmark buildings, the Villa is playing host to a parallel exhibition which showcases some of the artists' major works completed during his time in Rome, his impact on the building and its gardens and his working environment.

The main collection is being shown at the Scuderie del Quirinale, the former stables of the papal palace that is now the official residence of Italy's president. It features examples of work from every stage of Balthus's career, including landscapes, still lifes and portraits as well as some of the controversial erotic pieces and numerous works featuring cats, another of the artist's fixations.

Cecile Debray, the curator of the exhibition, said Balthus could virtually be considered a Roman given the importance of the time he spent here and the impact earlier trips to Italy had on him. "He was always fascinated both by the primitives of the Renaissance and by a certain form of classicism that was incarnated by Rome," Debray told AFPTV, describing the artist as a one-off. "He didn't belong to any movement. He was part of the generation of surrealists but never a surrealist himself and he was without doubt the greatest figurative painter of the 20th Century. "He was born in 1908, died in 2001. He lived through the entire 20th century and remained extremely faithful to an extremely realist form of painting, albeit a realism that absorbed a subtle and light form of fantasy. And I'd say it is that which makes the poetry and uniqueness of Balthus."

Question of pedophilia

This collection is lighter on the kind of images of girls on the cusp of womanhood that led one critic to brand Balthus "one of the creepiest figures in modern art" after the New York exhibition. Debray acknowledges that painting "very young girls with a very strong erotic suggestion" was a defining theme of Balthus's work, but robustly dismisses any suggestion the work could be regarded as indicative a predatory sexual interest in minors.

"Until now they never caused any debate but it is true that very recently we have seen some rather prudish reactions to his painting as there has been much debate around the subject of pedophilia," she said. "I think it is very important to recall that these are paintings, ie representations, and that Balthus was absolutely not a pedophile.

"It (what he is doing) is much more a reflection on the nature of eroticism, the nature of beauty and a sort of desire to engage the public on the essential subjects of eroticism and sexuality. "He wanted to shake up the art world through a very intelligent use of a realism that suggests erotic or grotesque atmospheres. It is this very individual painting that still engages the public today and can also still disturb." The exhibitions are on until the end of January after which the collection at the Scuderie will move to the Kunstforum in Vienna. — AFP
