AMIR URGES CLOSER ASSEMBLY-GOVT COOPERATION

KUWAIT: HH the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah yesterday advised leading legislators to seek to bolster cooperation between the legislative and executive authorities. HH the Amir, during his reception of the lawmakers, advised them to exert greater efforts and work hard for realizing citizens' aspirations and ambitions in a fashion that will contribute to beefing up development through cooperation between the legislative and executive authorities.

Sheikh Sabah gave the guidelines during a reception at Seif Palace for National Assembly Speaker Marzouq Ali Al-Ghanem and chairman of the committee tasked with replying to the Amiri address MP Odah Al-Rowaiee and committee members MP Abdullah Al-Maayouf, Humoud Al-Hamdan and Abdullah Al-Turaiji. They submitted to HH the Amir a report about the commission's response to the Amiri address for the fourth session of the 14th legislative term. Ghanem assured the Amir that he and his colleagues in the parliament would adhere to his guidelines for the welfare of the citizens and the homeland. — KUNA

KUWAIT: The National Assembly's financial and economic affairs committee yesterday rejected a government bill to raise electricity and water charges and made a proposal of its own to make the increases much lower for citizens. The committee however did not propose any changes for expatriates, leaving the proposed high tariffs unchanged. Head of the committee MP Faisal Al-Shaye said the committee gave the government until Wednesday to respond to its proposals.

The government's bill proposes to raise power charges from the current 2 fils per kilowatt for all purposes. For private houses, a term normally referring to Kuwaiti citizens, the government bill proposed a price of 5 fils per kilowatt for the first 3,000 kilowatts, 8 fils for between 3,000 and 6,000 kW, 10 fils for between 6,000 and 9,000 kW, and 15 fils for above 9,000 kW.

For apartments, a term normally referring to expatriates, the government proposed a price of 5 fils for up to 1,000 kW, 10 fils for between 1,000 and 2,000 kW and 15 fils for above 2,000 kW. Shaye said the committee proposed that the price should remain 2 fils per kilowatt for consumption of up to 6,000 kW and then 5 fils per kilowatt above that for private houses, or citizens. The committee did not propose any changes for apartments, which means it will remain the same as proposed by the

Shave said the committee's proposal will save a majority of low and middle income citizens from the increases, since according to official figures, a majority of private houses consume less than 6,000 kW per month.


AMIR RECEIVES SUDANESE FM, CZECH SPEAKER


HEAD OF ILLEGAL RESIDENTS' AGENCY RECEIVES US OFFICIAL

'8,000 adjust status in past five years'

KUWAIT: Executive Chairman of the Central Agency for Remedying Illegal Residents' Status Saleh Al-Fadalah yesterday received the political officer at the US embassy in Kuwait Lloyd Freeman. During the meeting, Fadalah reviewed the road map approved by the cabinet to handle the issue, the agency said in a press release.

In addition, Fadalah offered the US official a detailed explanation of the facilities and advantages the state provides for illegal residents, in line with the cabinet reso-

lution number 409/2011, the release added. He stressed that education and health services are guaranteed to all, with no exception. According to Fadalah, the agency's efforts have encouraged illegal residents to reveal their real nationalities, as 8,000 of them adjusted status over the past five years. He emphasized the fact that "nationality" is a sovereign right of the state, but this does not mean cancelling naturalization, as huge numbers were naturalized over the past two decades. —KUNA

KUWAIT EMBARKS ON GFMIS IN GOVT BODIES

KUWAIT: Kuwait is among the first world countries to use the Government Financial Management Information System (GFMIS), Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance and Acting Oil Minister Anas Al-Saleh. He made the statement during an

inspection tour yesterday, the first day the GFMIS is applied in 47 government bodies.

It is a major step for promoting management of state finances, Saleh said. He added that the system enables consistent budget preparation and execution processes across all spending agencies during the fiscal year. It also provides realtime access to financial data to make informed decisions.

This helps decision makers emend any financial resolutions.

The bodies using the GFMIS have been offered intensive training over the past four months. There are up to 5,000 users of the system that will turn all the financial and accounting transactions into automotive systems, from procurement to registration in financial records. The GFMIS computerizes the entire life-cycle of budget preparation, budget execution, and financial

It is an integrated system that will work across all spending agencies to ensure transparency and accountability in the allocation, use and monitoring of valuable public resources. The system will link all government institutions to support an

informed decision-making process. Meanwhile, the Finance Ministry's Undersecretary Khalifa Hamada said that the application of GFMIS in min-

istries and other government bodies and departments, totaling 47, crowns the outcome of the reengineering financial operations project, one of the leading in the region. It is among the leading

Anas Al-Saleh projects in the region, he

added, noting that the country's financial systems were restructured to keep pace with the world's standard practices, in a bid to fulfill the needs of all government bodies. According to Hamada, Kuwait will adopt a new classification of the state budget, in line with the international criteria. He said that the leading international Oracle company was selected for enterprise resource planning (ERP), that will function as the official systems for managing the government finances. — KUNA

PANEL DISCUSSES WAYS TO REMOVE HOUSING PROJECTS' OBSTACLES

KUWAIT: The Municipal Council's reform and development committee recommended forming a team including elements from the council, Kuwait Municipality and relevant government bodies to accelerate the execution and handover of government housing projects, study various impediments and report on them so that proper solutions could be made.

During a workshop on housing projects and procedural municipal obstacles held yesterday in the presence of the Director of the Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW) Bader Al-Weqayyan, Kuwait Municipality Director Ahmad Al-Manfouhi and other officials, the committee discussed how to overcome such obstacles. Weqayyan said that there was a time limit for contractors to commence working on any project after signing the contract. He also stressed that contractors usually refuse taking responsibility for any projects until all obstacles are removed and overcome.

He added that upon Central Tenders Committee (CTC) recommendations, bids for Mutlaa City, which is a comprehensive one including road, rain, sewage, water, treated water and telephone grids, would be opened on April 24. Weqayyan added that relevant authorities were currently working on removing obstacles hindering the construction of South Saad Al-Abdullah housing project and stressed that the project would not be called off.

Manfouhi said that the South Saad Al-Abdullah obstacles would be removed according to a schedule set by the concerned authori-

ties. "The municipality scrap area will be removed by the beginning of 2017," he underlined, noting that the project would provide 25,000 housing units.

Also speaking at the workshop, Municipal Council member Abdullah Al-Kandari said that both sites were not fit for human dwelling because of the presence of high-voltage power lines and 42 artesian wells that need to be radically tended to before turning the site into a residential area or city.

KNPC LIKELY TO MAKE CONSIDERABLE PROFITS

KUWAIT: Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC) is anticipated to achieve good profits in the fiscal year that ended last March, said Deputy CEO of KNPC's Shuaiba Refinery Mutlaq Al-Azmi. "The FY ending on March 31 has not been reviewed yet. But, God willing, there will be good profits for the KNPC," Azmi said yesterday on the sidelines of the 3rd Kuwait Industrial Exhibition Technical Conference (KINETIC-

The 2030 strategy of the state-owned Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) is being revised to become 2040 strategy, he added. He said refining industry's profits are based on the price difference between oil byproducts and crude oil, and refining earnings rely on a set of factors,

He added that the price difference is now improving, but the oil market, especially in winter, has needed oil byproducts and that's why demand has increased and the prices of some products like kerosene and diesel have also

Azmi noted that the KNPC's fresh projects, mainly the new refinery and biofuel ventures, are part of the KPC's oil development strategy. KFAED PARTAKES IN JORDAN'S WIND POWER PLANT

MA'AN: The Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) participated yesterday in the launching of a wind power plant in Ma'an Governorate, some 230km south of Amman. The KFAED's financial aid to the project is part of a donation pledged by the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) for development projects in Jordan.

The launching ceremony was attended by KFAED Director-General Abdulwahab Al-Bader, Kuwaiti Ambassador in Amman Hamad Al-Duaij and Jordanian Energy Minister Ibrahim Saif as well as several other Jordanian officials.

Bader said the \$50 millon wind power station is mainly intended to produce 80 megawatts of wind power. He added that the project, together with the recently launched Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad port project in Agaba, are vital projects that aim to provide low-cost energy in Jordan. Bader noted that April is the beginning of the fifth and last year of the timetable for Kuwait's \$1.2 billion grant

to Jordan. Jordanian Energy Minister Ibrahim Saif said meanwhile that the wind power plant is of paramount significance to Jordan, noting that his country really needs sustainable projects, mainly in the energy sector. He highly appreciated the Kuwaiti government for its contribution to this "vital and significant" project launched in Maan, which is the

largest governorate in Jordan. Also, Engineer Farouq Al-Atawna, the project manager, underlined the importance of the project due to the high cost of gas and oil energy. He elaborated that the project includes the installation of 40 wind turbines with a rated power of two megawatts, and that it would be linked to the country's national power grid. He added that the Jordanian government plans to invest around USD 4.5 billion in the renewable energy sector by 2025. Wind speeds in Jordan are as high as 7.5 meters per second and up to 11.5 meters per second in hilly areas. — KUNA



MARIJUANA AND THE LAW IN KUWAIT

n the past ten years or so, more and more countries are leaning towards legalizing or have legalized the personal use of the drug widely known as marijuana. Even more countries have moved towards decriminalizing the drug. Decriminalizing, in simple terms, means that there aren't any criminal consequences for those that use the drug. But the use of the drug remains illegal. At least eight major countries have legalized marijuana and there are 36 other countries where marijuana is either decriminalized, tolerated or the law is 'unenforceable.'

Since this is a legal column, I will refrain from mentioning my personal beliefs towards the use of 'soft' drugs such as marijuana and the legal trends that we have been seeing mostly from western countries in the past decade. But I think it is necessary for me to mention that not all legal trends from progressive countries are necessarily right or better for our Kuwaiti society. Let me be clear: I am not advocating for such ideas.

Instead, I am writing about the legal implications of marijuana use in Kuwait due to clients' requests. I keep receiving emails from mostly younger western or western educated-clients who mistakenly think that marijuana is "not that bad" in Kuwait. In reality, Kuwait alongside other GCC countries has one of the strictest laws regarding the use of marijuana in the world.

Consequences

Question: What are the consequences for smoking marijuana in Kuwait?

Fajer: The Penal law in Kuwait was promulgated (issued) in 1960 and has for the most part not changed regarding drug use. Drugs in Kuwait by regulations are listed into three categories regarding how serious or harmful the drug can be and therefore the punishments differ according to the category the drug is in under. Marijuana is illegal in Kuwait in accordance to article number 208, where a person that uses marijuana for personal use and in private can receive up to two years jail and/or a fine not exceeding KD 2,000.

Facilitating

Question: This is going to sound silly, but I heard from someone that even if a person is not smoking, but just sitting next to someone that is smoking, they could get punished? Is this true? What is the logic behind this?

Fajer: Your question is not silly. I have heard the same as well many times, even in Kuwaiti shows. I think the basis to that statement is from Article number 207 of Kuwait Penal Law that states the following, "penalized for a period not exceeding seven years in jail and/or a fine not exceeding KD 7,000 for drug dealing, or making it easier for another person to use drugs."

The article above mentions that people that are not smoking but are 'facilitating' the use for others could be punishable by law as well. So a good example would be if you had your friends over and you were not smoking marijuana but you were in the same room, then technically you 'made it easier' for them to smoke and therefore could be punished up to seven years jail, yet they would only be punished up to two years jail.

Question: I lost my wallet and it had marijuana in it. The police called me to pick up my wallet and I am worried to go and pick it up. What should I do?

Fajer: In such a case you really need to hire a lawyer. Some lawyers would be more than happy to twist the facts in order to "save" you from being punished. The lawyer will also help you with what to say and what to do. Unfortunately though, I cannot answer such a question, as I need to know more specifics.

Police report

Question: When the police write a report about the use of marijuana how, do they differentiate between personal and commercial use? Is it by the amount of marijuana that is caught on the offender?

Fajer: Well, the answer to your question depends on a few different factors. Generally speaking, yes the amount of marijuana on a person can lead the police report to be worded differently pushing towards personal or commercial use. But other factors can make a difference too. For example, if an offender is caught with a small amount of weed but he also has in his possession a weight and scissors or other equipment used to divide and measure marijuana, then he could easily be accused of possessing marijuana for commercial purposes.

As I have mentioned above, Kuwait's law is considerably strict when it comes to the use of marijuana and other recreational drugs. Therefore it is best, especially for foreigners that are here to work and find a means of living, to avoid such drugs that might be legal or decriminalized in their own country. Stay safe people.

PROPOSED ENERGY FEES 'TOO EXAGGERATED'

KUWAIT: MP Dr Ahmad Mutee' stressed that he would firmly reject the government's project that include higher electricity tariffs, saying that the proposed fees are 'too exaggerated.' "Jumping to four folds of the current prices is unacceptable and will negatively affect citizens' income," he explained, urging the government to look for other ways to solve the budget deficit problem. Mutee' added that the new electricity fees would cause price increases in various other fields, including real estate and rent values.

The Ministry of Electricity and Water (MEW) had stated Saturday that a monthly electricity and water bill would not exceed KD 70 (\$232) on basis of government's proposed tariff increase. Mashaan Al-Otaibi, MEW's Assistant Undersecretary for Planning and Training, was brushing aside social media reporting what he called "exaggerated" tariffs if the proposed increase was implemented. These reports "are not true and were based on unrealistic assumptions of the monthly consumption," he said in a statement. Otaibi said the proposed tariff increase aimed at cutting consumption of public, explaining that around 70 percent of citizens' monthly bills were below KD 50. If the public decrease consumption by 70 percent, he said, the monthly bill would not exceed KD 70.

Development projects

Meanwhile, MP Dr Abdullah Al-Turaiji strongly criticized the government over the way it handled development projects and the contracts' signed with various companies. He gave the oil pipes' deal as an example, noting that it reflects how contradicting the government acted and how it yielded to pressure and blackmail.

"What is the secret behind delaying the deal despite the fact that it meets all conditions," Turaiji wondered, indicating that referring the project to the Fatwa and Legislation Department after the investor had lawfully won the deal implies a 'profiteering attempt due to some pressure'. He also warned the Finance Minister and Acting Oil minister Anas Al-Saleh of yielding to pressure. Turaiji also criticized what he described as the silence of Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammed Al-Abdullah Al-Sabah over accusing the head of the Fatwa and Legislation Department of being biased. "Does this silence confirm the accusation?" he wondered.

Violations

Chairman of the parliament's final statement and budgets committee MP Adnan Abdulsamad said that the committee discussed the budget of the public authority for Quran and prophet traditions and sciences for the year 2016-2017, and detected many violations and imbalances. Abdulsamad added that the authority was not cooperative.

BARRAK'S 'AUDIOVISUAL LAW' CASE ADJOURNED

KUWAIT: The criminal court yesterday heard a case filed by the Ministry of Information against former MP Musallam Al-Barrak and Al-Youm TV channel, accusing them of violating the audiovisual law. The ministry says that Barrak slandered a number of political and social figures during an interview aired by Al-Youm TV. The court adjourned the case until May 9, and is expected to pass its sentence then.

Public property eased from prison v

A citizen was released from prison yesterday after being subjected to investigations over graffiti he reportedly drawn on a wall in Khaitan. The suspect is facing charges of damaging public property by drawing some portrays of former MP Musallam Al-Barrak.

Embezzlement

The criminal court also sentenced a former senior oil official and a Lebanese employee of an electrical appliances company to ten years in prison each. The court found the defendants guilty of embezzling KD 86,000. The court also fined both defendants with twice as much of the money they embezzled.

Police attacker remanded

A citizen who intentionally ran his vehicle through a checkpoint during the recent national celebrations was remanded in custody yesterday. The man's actions had left one policeman dead and several others injured.

State security

The public prosecution remanded in custody a citizen pending further investigations, in a case filed against him by the state security over charges of slandering His Highness the Amir, public instigation, harming public security, violating the national unity law and endangering Kuwait's relations with a friendly country.

Report

DETECTIVES ARREST SIX HIGH-END PROSTITUTES

KUWAIT: An informed security source said criminal detectives, on the orders of Director General Major General Abdelhameed Al-Awadhi, ordered the deportation of six European women after discovering they had arrived in Kuwait to provide sexual services for \$1,000 per hour. The source said investigations revealed that the women, who came from two European countries, work for a prostitution network that operates through the Internet, and they were asked to come to the country and not move from their hotels until they received calls from the network's officials. The women stayed in mostly five-star hotels, entering the country taking advantage of the visa waiver scheme. The six also did not know each other. The women were arrested with some money with them. They said they do not take money directly from customers, but sometimes they get tips.

Passports forgery

Interior Ministry's Assistant Undersecretary for Nationality and Passports Affairs Major General Mazen Al-Jarrah said three Saudi brothers received Kuwait nationality using different files of Kuwaitis, as each added himself on the file of a different 'father'. The forgery did not last long, and the three were arrested and taken to the public prosecution for questioning.

Smuggling foiled

An Asian man was arrested at Kuwait International Airport for attempting to smuggle around 3 kg of marijuana hidden in a bag of vegetables. He was sent to concerned authorities. Separately, Nuwaiseeb border outlet customs officers foiled an attempt of a Gulf national to smuggle 170 illicit tablets on his arrival into the country. A customs officer said the man seemed nervous and worried, then when his car was searched the tablets were found. He was sent to concerned authorities.

Reckless driver arrested

Jahra police arrested a juvenile who drove recklessly in Sulaibiya. A security source said patrol officers saw the driver of a sports car showing off and endangering the lives of others. He was asked to stop but refused. A policeman tried to stop him by ramming his car, but the suspect was able to escape, and police spent 14 hours looking for him before he was arrested.

Liquor possession

An Asian man was sent to the Drugs Control General Department with large quantities of liquor. A police patrol officer noticed a bus on the road across from Hadiya, and when a police patrol vehicle stopped behind it, the driver fled on foot and almost was run over attempting to cross the highway, but he was caught. When the bus was searched, a large quantity of locallymade liquor was found. The suspect said he was going to sell it after getting it from Abu Halifa. —Al-Anbaa

KUWAIT: A KD 5 billion deficit was detected in the 2015/2016 budget, and that is before deducting KD 1.3 billion for the future generations fund, or 10 percent of the total budget. Total spending in the fiscal year ending on March 31, 2016 reached around KD 18.3 billion while revenues reached around KD 13 billion. —Al-Anbaa

KD 5 million wasted

KUWAIT: The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) wasted an opportunity for the state to earn around KD 5 million when it failed to put the contract of Kuwait International Airport's duty free market for an auction, the State Audit Bureau said. —Al-Qabas

Mediation



KUWAIT 'NOT YET READY' FOR TAXES

KUWAIT: "Do not believe the rumors; Kuwait is not yet ready for taxes," said sources that are acquainted with the taxation issue, which raises controversies about the government's confirmations of the nearness of imposing a 10 percent tax on company profits and a five percent val-

10 percent tax on company profits and a ue added tax. So, is Kuwait technically and logistically

The sources added that the government is capable of imposing the law at once, but remarked that this requires setting a system to be used by the finance ministry's taxation sector. "This would at least need to double the number

ready for taxes?

of tax assessors from 200 to 400 to do the extra tasks," explained the sources, adding that once the draft law is passed by the parliament, the government would not be able to put it into practice because the database of companies to be subjected to the new system would dramat-

ically increase to include Kuwaiti and non-Kuwaiti ones in addition to those with limited liabilities and individual-owed ones.

In addition, the sources said that the total number of tax experts operating in local market is below 100 and

that this number would not be enough. "The government will need at least 18-24 months to put the new system into practice," added the sources, noting that the government would have to go through six phases during this period in order to contact various companies, get them acquainted with

how their taxes would be calculated, have them seek experts' services and communicate with limited-liability companies. Moreover, the sources ironically remarked that once the taxation law is in effect, even grocery stores would need to seek help from tax experts and auditors. —Al-Rai

2-MONTH IMPOUNDING FOR VEHICLES DRIVING ON RIGHT SHOULDERS

KUWAIT: The Interior Ministry's Assistant Undersecretary for Traffic Affairs Major General Abdullah Al-Muhanna issued a decision allowing the impounding of cars driven on the right emergency lane for two months. Muhanna categorized violations as follows.

First: If the car is driven on the left shoulder during the allowed time with a speed over 45 km/h, a violation of police instructions will be registered.

Second: If the car is driven on the left shoulder out of the allowed time, a violation of driving on the shoulder will be recorded.

Third: Driving on the right shoulder is not allowed at all, and the car will be impounded and a ticket for driving on the shoulder will be issued.

Fourth: The violating car can be impounded according to what is mentioned in items second and third (two month impoundment). —Al-Aan

ENOUGH DARK SIDES

HANDLING COSTS AT SHUAIBA PORT UP 192%

KUWAIT: Construction material suppliers spoke about their suffering due to a lack of organization and randomness in handling shipments from ships at Shuaiba Port piers, and asking them to pay a higher fee for one of the two handling companies operating in the port, which presents its services at KD 0.350 per ton while the cost is KD 0.120 per ton for the other company, an increase of 192 percent.

They said competition between the two companies has gone way out of normal since three months, which calls for presenting better services at a lower price, pointing out that pressure on suppliers increases to deal with the more expensive company with the claim that it has new equipment, while the handling process needs speed in unloading shipments, which the other company is distinguished for.

They said the average annual handling bill for suppliers was KD 400,000 at the old rate, while with the new prices, it will jump to KD 1 million. They said this will reflect on prices of vital materials such as steel and gravel, which the citizen and government will bear under the development projects being executed and future projects. —Al-Qabas



22,250 VIOLENCE CASES IN SCHOOLS

KUWAIT: Violence in schools has spread for various reasons, as recent educational statistics found that there were 22,250 cases of verbal and physical abuse of teachers and students in various school stages. The statistics revealed that schools witnessed 2,616 verbal and physical attacks on teachers of both genders by students, 1,367 in girls' schools and 1,249 in boys', 2,318 of which were verbal and 304 physical attacks.

The statistics showed 19,585 verbal and physical attacks occurred between students in all school stages, 11,257 of which were verbal and 8,332 physical attacks. Boys' schools witnessed 10,785 cases while girle's schools 8,804 cases.

witnessed 10,785 cases while girls' schools 8,804 cases. The statistics showed that the number of attacks on teachers in the secondary stage was 1,082, 938 in the intermediate and 603 in the elementary stage. Secondary stage schools saw 2,617 cases of students attacking their classmates, be it verbal or physical, but the intermediate stage saw 5,962 cases in all classes, while the elementary stage saw 11,064 cases. —Al-Qabas

MOI INVESTIGATIONS ON LAPTOPS, TABLETS

KUWAIT: Following the legal approval of e-signatures and using them officially, the Ministry of Interior's (Mol) Criminal Investigations Department is currently preparing an e-investigation project to be experimentally used by June in the special misdemeanor department, then in the Capital governorate before expanding the project by the beginning of next year when the investigations directorate would become 'paperless' and use electronic investigations.

Security sources said that the investigation directorate's automation committee recently met Mol's Automatic Information Center where they input investigation forms into computers so that they could be included in the center's approved electronic forms.

The source added that investigators with computer literacy would be provided laptops, while others who prefer using e-pens to fill in the forms would be provided tablets so that after filling the form, they would ask a suspect to e-sign it. "Investigations clerks would then scan, upload and attach the documents related to the case like IDs, medical reports and other certificates," explained the sources, noting that once the case was electronically referred to court, a receipt would be given.

Further, the sources referred to instructions about applying e-government procedures in a bid to end paperwork, cut down time, effort, end bureaucracy and shorten litigation time. Finally, the sources explained that investigators would undergo special training courses on how to use laptops or tablets in filling in legal forms and having suspects electronically sign them. —Al-Rai

FLIGHTS RESUME AT BRUSSELS AIRPORT

BRUSSELS: Brussels Airport partially reopened yesterday, 12 days after it was hit by Islamic State attacks, with tearful staff applauding the first departure and an initial trickle of passengers undergoing strict new security checks. The key travel hub has been closed since two men blew themselves up in the departure hall on March 22 in coordinated blasts that also struck a metro station in the Belgian capital, killing a total of 32 people. A Brussels Airlines plane bound for the Portuguese city of Faro became the first plane to take off around 1140 GMT.

Emotional employees and government officials marked the moment with a minute's silence followed by hugs and a round of applause, AFP reporters saw. On the tarmac, fire engines and police vehicles formed a guard of honor for the Airbus A320. "We're back," Brussels Airport chief executive Arnaud Feist said after watching the plane, decked out with Belgian artist Magritte's trademark birds and clouds, take to the skies.

The departure was followed by two later flights to Athens and Turin, in what Feist called a "symbolic" reopening of the airport. The same three planes were to return to Brussels with passengers later yesterday. The restart of the airport has been hailed as the beginning of a return to normal for a traumatised country, but the shadow of the attacks loomed large. Two big white tents were serving as temporary check-in facilities to replace the blast-hit departure hall, and passengers were asked to come three hours before departure to allow time for tight new security checks.

The first several dozen travellers to arrive yes-

terday were met by heavily armed police and soldiers on the access roads to the airport. There was also a strong security presence inside the tents where passengers walked through metal detectors and had their bags screened before checking in and being allowed to enter the main building. A father dropping off his son and a group of friends for the Faro flight was positive about the changes. "This is the safest airport in the world right now, isn't it?" he told reporters.

'We Can Overcome This'

Loukas Bassoukos, a 20-year-old IT student waiting for his flight to Athens, said it felt "a bit weird" to be among the first to return to the bomb-hit airport. "So many people died here," he told AFP. "But I think we can overcome this. I think we slowly have to start trusting the security controls." Psychologists were on hand to assist any passengers overcome with emotion. Under the new system, only passengers with travel and ID documents are allowed into the makeshift departure hall, and all bags will be checked before entering. Once inside, travellers will still have to go past the usual security barriers.

The airport will initially only be accessible by car, with no access for buses and trains. Vehicles will be screened and subject to spot checks. The number of flights will be stepped up quickly in coming days. Still, the airport will only be able to work at 20 percent capacity at best using the temporary facilities, handling 800 to 1,000 passengers an hour. It will take months to repair the departure hall, according to Feist. The damage from the blasts was severe, with pictures from the scene showing the building's glass-fronted facade in shatters, collapsed ceilings and destroyed check-in desks. Feist said he expected the airport to start running normally again from late June or early July.

Sing-Along

The closure of Zaventem airport has wreaked havoc on the travel industry, triggering a drop in tourist arrivals and forcing thousands of passengers to be rerouted to other airports in and around Belgium. Brussels Airport, which claims to contribute some three billion euros (\$3.4 billion) annually to the Belgian economy, has not released any figures on the economic impact of the shutdown, but top carrier Brussels Airlines

has said it was losing five million euros daily. In a setback for the airport, Delta Air Lines at the weekend said it was suspending services between Brussels and Atlanta until March 2017 due to the "uncertainty surrounding the reopening of Brussels airport and weakening demand". With 260 companies on-site employing some 20,000 staff overall, the airport is one of the country's largest employers.

In the still-grieving capital meanwhile, one thousand people took part in a sing-along in a central square that has become a shrine to the attack victims. In celebration of all things Belgian, they sang "Moules frites" by Stromae and "Bruxelles" by Jacques Brel. Belgian police are still hunting for a mystery third suspect in the Brussels attacks, dubbed "the man in the hat", who was seen in CCTV footage next to the two airport bombers. — AFP

NAGORNO-KARABAKH **CLASHES CONTINUE**

TERTER, Azerbaijan: Clashes between Azerbaijani and Armenian forces rumbled yesterday, despite Baku announcing a ceasefire after the worst outbreak of violence in decades over the disputed Nagorno-Karabakh region sparked international pressure to stop fighting. Azerbaijan said it had decided to "unilaterally cease hostilities" and pledged to "reinforce" several strategic positions it claimed to have captured inside the Armenian-controlled territory.

The Armenia-backed authorities in Karabakh - which claims independence but is heavily backed by Yerevan - said they were willing to discuss a ceasefire but only if it saw them regain their territory. Both sides accused each other of continuing to fire across the volatile frontline that has divided them since a war that saw Armenian separatists seize the region from Azerbaijan ended with an inconclusive truce in 1994. "The Armenians have continued shelling throughout the day, without interruption," Azerbaijani defence ministry spokesman Vagif Dargahly

"Fighting with the use of tanks and artillery continues as Azerbaijan is telling lies that it halted hostilities. Azerbaijan continues shelling both Karabakh army positions and Armenian villages," Armenian defence ministry spokesman Artsrun Hovhannisyan told AFP. An AFP photographer in the Azerbaijani town of Terter - around ten kilometres from the frontline - reported hearing sporadic shooting yesterday afternoon.

Men carried a coffin draped in Azerbaijan's flag through the streets as the funeral of an Azeri soldier killed in the clashes was held. At least three houses were destroyed by shelling and women and children had been evacuated. Fierce clashes left at least 18 Armenian and 12 Azerbaijani soldiers dead Saturday after the two sides accused each other of attacking with heavy weaponry across the volatile frontline.

The Karabakh authorities said one boy was killed in the fighting, while Azerbaijan said two civilians died and ten were wounded. Armenia's President Serzh Sarkisian called the clashes the "largest-scale hostilities" since a 1994 truce ended a war in which Armenianbacked fighters seized the territory from Azerbaijan. Azerbaijan said one of its helicopters was shot down as its forces took control of several strategic heights and a village in Armenian-controlled territory. Karabakh


forces yesterday claimed they took back the strategic Lala-Tepe height in Karabakh which was captured by Azeri troops on Saturday. Baku denied the report, saying that the height remained under its control and that rebel troops sustained "serious manpower

Appeals for Calm

Both Russia and the West appealed to all sides to show restraint, with key regional power broker President Vladimir Putin calling Saturday for an "immediate ceasefire". Moscow has supplied weaponry to both sides in the conflict, but has much closer military and economic ties to Armenia and Yerevan is reliant on Russia's backing. US Secretary of State John Kerry urged the arch foes to return to peace talks under the auspices of the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), reiterating "there is no military solution to the conflict". Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan meanwhile vowed to back traditional ally Azerbaijan "to the end" in the conflict. "We pray our Azerbaijani brothers will prevail in these clashes with the least casualties," Erdogan said.

Ethnic Armenian separatists backed by Yerevan seized control of the mountainous Nagorny Karabakh region in an early 1990s war that claimed some 30,000 lives. The foes have never signed a peace deal despite the 1994 ceasefire. Energy-rich Azerbaijan, whose military spending has in the past exceeded Armenia's entire state budget, has repeatedly threatened to take back the breakaway region by force if negotiations fail to yield results. Moscow-backed Armenia says it could crush any offensive. The last big flare-up occurred in Nov 2014 when Azerbaijan shot down an Armenian military helicopter.

While the reasons for the sudden surge remain unclear, analyst Thomas de Waal of Carnegie Europe wrote that the "potential for a serious outbreak of fighting has never been greater" as both sides have bolstered their arms. "It is more likely that one of the two parties to the conflict - and more likely the Azerbaijani side, which has a stronger interest in the resumption of hostilities - is trying to alter the situation in its favor with a limited military campaign," de Waal wrote in a blog posting. "The dangerous aspect to this is that, once begun, any military operations in this conflict zone can easily escalate and get out of control." — AFP

OLD DISPUTE SEPARATES WESTERN SAHARA FAMILIES

SMARA REFUGEE CAMP, Algeria: Ergueibi dragged on for a quarter century. A 1991 Abdelahi was just nine months old when his ceasefire ended one and a half decades of Abdelahi was just nine months old when his aunt scooped him up and fled fighting in Western Sahara after Morocco sent troops into the former Spanish colony, leaving his parents and brother behind. Until he was 10, he thought his aunt was his mother. "She (my mother) was at the market on the day we ran," Abdelahi says of their escape in 1978 across the border into Algeria. "From what I was told, people fled the bombing barefoot. We arrived in the refugee camp and never left."

Abdelahi's family is just one of thousands split up in the war that broke out after Morocco annexed the vast desert territory in 1975 in a move that was not recognized by the international community. Tens of thousands of Sahrawis live as refugees in the west of Algeria, while some of their relatives remained hundreds of kilometres away in Western Sahara. Their future today looks even more uncertain after a diplomatic row broke out last month when UN chief Ban Ki-moon referred to Western Sahara's "occupation" during a visit to a refugee camp.

A furious Morocco expelled dozens of UN personnel and demanded the United Nations close its military liaison office in Western Sahara. The incident has stalled UN efforts to broker a settlement for the area that have fighting between Morocco and the pro-independence Polisario Front backed by Algeria. But Rabat remains unwavering in its insistence that Western Sahara is an integral part of its kingdom. Larger than Britain but with a population of under one million people, Western Sahara has lucrative phosphate reserves, rich fishing grounds and potentially oil. Sahrawis are campaigning for the right to self-determination, but Morocco insists its sovereignty cannot be challenged.

'Mother, Father and Brother'

Abdelahi is now almost 40 years old and heads the editorial team at Radio Smara, a small radio station that broadcasts for three hours a day out of the Smara refugee camp near the Moroccan border. His wife and three children were all born in the same camp, near Tinouf around 1,800 km west of Algiers. It is named after a town in Western Sahara. At least 90,000 Sahrawi refugees live off international aid in five camps in the Tinouf area, according to the UN. The Algerian government says the number is closer to 165,000.

For decades, the two sides of Abdelahi's family - one in Western Sahara, the other in the refugee camp - were unsure of each other's existence, he says. "Those who had fled thought those who stayed had been jailed or had died, and those who stayed under the occupation thought the same about those who had escaped." The Polisario Front provided Abdelahi with a second family, he says. "I've always thought the Polisario was my mother, father and brother." In 2011, he was finally able to see his family again in Western Sahara, thanks to a family visit program run by the UN refugee agency with agreement from Morocco and the Polisario. "It was very moving," he says. "But we had to go straight to the hospital to see my mother who had not been sleeping for a week."

Boys Turned 'Old Men'

Others have not been so lucky. Mohammed Cheikh Kentaoui was 19 years old when Morocco annexed Western Sahara. He fled with a pair of military boots, determined to fight the Moroccan army. But instead the Polisario assigned him a teaching job in a refugee camp. Two decades later, he was in the Algerian capital when he heard his mother had died. Kentaoui, now an accountant with three daughters, leafs through a family photo album in the Smara camp, telling his story as his wife prepares

SYRIAN FORCES SEIZE IS BASTION NEAR PALMYRA

NUSRA REBELS KILL 12 HEZBOLLAH FIGHTERS

DAMASCUS: Syrian troops yesterday seized the key Islamic State group bastion of Al-Qaryatain, dealing the jihadists a new blow in the country's centre a week after expelling them from Palmyra, state television said. The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitoring group however said fighting was still raging in the east and southeast of the town, which is located in the desert in Homs province. "The army with backing from supporting forces (pro-regime militia) brings back complete security and stability to the town of Al-Qaryatain, after crushing Daesh terrorists' last remaining positions there," state television said, using an Arabic acronym for IS.

But the Britain-based Observatory said the army was still fighting the jihadists in the town, "Clashes are still ongoing in the east and southeast of the town," it said. The advance came after the Russianbacked Syrian army dealt IS a major blow on March 27 by seizing the ancient city of Palmyra, known as the "Pearl of the desert", from the jihadists. AlOarvatain is located some 120 km southwest of Palmyra. Its recapture will allow the army to secure its grip over the ancient city, where jihadists destroyed ancient temples and executed around 280 people during their 10-month rule.

Once Al-Qaryatain returns to government control, "of the whole of Homs province, IS will only hold its bastion in Sukhna" northeast of Palmyra, Observatory chief Rami Abdel Rahman said. "The recapture of Al-Oarvatain will also allow the army to reclaim the whole of the Syrian desert" spreading all the way south to the Iragi border, Abdel Rahman added. A ceasefire brokered by the United States and Russia but which does not apply to the fight against jihadists has enabled the Syrian army to focus its efforts on IS.

IS Executions

The group has also lost a string of high-ranking commanders in recent weeks to strikes by the USled coalition which launched an air campaign against the jihadists in Iraq and Syria in 2014. A drone strike on Wednesday, likely by the coalition, killed Abu Al-Haija, a Tunisian commander summoned by IS leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi from Iraq. Fifteen IS commanders accused of revealing Abu Al-Haija's position have since been executed by the jihadist group, the Observatory said yesterday. The fate of another 20 men accused of collaborating with the US-led coalition remains unknown, it added. "This is the highest number of executions of security officials by IS," Abdel Rahman said. The Observatory said yesterday that 12 fighters from Lebanon's Hezbollah were killed fighting the Al-Qaeda-affiliated Al-Nusra Front and allied rebels in the northern province of Aleppo. They died "in shelling and fighting in the south of Aleppo province, during the fierce offensive by Al-Nusra... and rebels the day before yesterday (Friday)," the group said. Hezbollah has since 2013 been openly fighting in Syria in support of President Bashar Al-Assad's regime. — AFP

IN ISTANBUL, A BOOKSTORE **ANCHORS SYRIAN REFUGEES**

ISTANBUL: A rustic, three story-Arabic bookstore in old Istanbul has become an anchor for many Syrians who have stayed put in Turkey but crave a taste of home. The founder and owner of Pages, Samer Al-Kadri, a refugee himself, says the store strives to be a bridge between Syrians, Turks and the myriad of foreigners who visit the city. Its weekly program includes music concerts and, starting soon, language exchanges in Arabic, English and Turkish. Books are available in all three languages. Kadri is acutely aware that the language barrier "has made it difficult for Syrians to really integrate into society."

Turkey is hosting 2.7 million Syrian refugees and is due to receive many more under a plan with the European Union that aims to halt the smuggling of migrants into Europe. The deal stipulates that for every Syrian returned, another Syrian in Turkey will be relocated to a European country. The plan has drawn considerable criticism from human rights groups, who worry that Turkey is not a suitable haven for asylum-seekers and fear it could pave the way for mass deportations. Amnesty International says Turkey has already scaled down its registration of Syrian refugees and is illegally sending back refugees to its war-torn neighbor.

The Turkish Foreign Ministry denies

this and says the country maintains its open-door policy and adheres to the principle of not returning Syrians. In the eyes of many Syrians, the deal has rendered them pawns in a political bargain that benefits everyone but them. Ola Suleiman, a new employee at the bookstore, says there's a touch of "evil" to the deal because "they are deciding the fate of a people". While her middle-class family is among the Syrians who are doing better for themselves in Istanbul, it hasn't been easy. The cost of life in Turkey is far higher than in pre-war or even post-war Syria. Most Syrian refugees live outside the camps and largely fend for them-

Suleiman and her siblings work six days a week without vacation just to keep their household afloat. Technically many Syrians do not have the right to work. Suleiman does not have a work contract let alone health insurance. This, she says, leaves Syrian workers vulnerable to exploitation while allowing Turkish business owners to evade taxes. Turkey has committed to giving work permits to its Syrian "guests" but there are signs this perk may be riddled with caveats. Still, Suleiman likes working in a bookshop and treasures the precious moments that allow her to read once again. — AP

SYRIA PARLIAMENTARY VOTE CAMPAIGN ON WAR FOOTING

DAMASCUS: The streets of Damascus are plastered with campaign posters and banners as President Bashar Al-Assad's regime pushes ahead with parliamentary elections despite Syria's nearly five-year-old civil war. The war is dominating the campaign for the April 13 vote, which will see nearly 12,000 candidates vying for seats in Syria's 250-seat legislature. As with the 2012 parliamentary election and a 2014 presidential vote, only Syrians living in government-held areas will be able to cast their ballots. "We stand for security," reads one campaign slogan. "For the sake of the children who were killed, we will continue," vows another.

One candidate has branded himself as "the voice of the martyrs and the injured", while another claims to represent "the martyrs of our heroic army". The upcoming vote is the second legislative election held by the Damascus regime since the outbreak of civil war in 2011. A total of 11,341 candidates aged 25 and above are competing. While Assad has hailed the "unprecedented" number of candidates running for MP, Western backers of the anti-regime revolt have lashed out at the elections. French President Francois Hollande, for one, has branded them "provocative" and "totally unrealistic".

On March 10, the domestic opposition which is tolerated in Damascus called for a widespread boycott, accusing the government of using the vote to gain leverage in peace talks. The High Negotiations Committee, the main exiled opposition body, has branded the vote "illegitimate". Key Damascus backer Russian President Vladimir Putin, however, has shot back saying the planned vote "does not interfere with steps to build the peace process". The United Nations, for its part, has called for presidential and parliamentary elections within the next 18 months as part of the process.

No Vote in Raqa

Syria's war, which has left over 270,000 dead, has also had a devastating impact on the economy. "Together, let's help the Syrian pound regain its former glory," one banner reads. Over the past five years, the exchange rate has soared from 50 pounds to the dollar to 500 pounds. Another poster calls for "eradicating corruption and building a new Syria". Hisham Al-Shaar, head of Syria's electoral committee, said "the elections will be held everywhere except in Raqa and Idlib provinces," both areas controlled by the jihadist Islamic State group and the Al-Qaeda-affiliated Al-Nusra Front. Also excluded are "regions where there are security problems", Shaar said, referring to rebel-held areas.

Residents of the eastern province of Deir Ezzor, much of which is controlled by IS, will be able to cast ballots "in voting stations in Damascus and its province, as well as in Hasakeh" in the northeast, he told AFP. "Together, hand in hand, we will rebuild Syria," pledges one banner put up by a candidate from Deir Ezzor, which borders Iraq. Another candidate from the same war-ravaged province proclaims: "Victorious Syria votes."

While parliamentary hopefuls are allowed to hold meetings, distribute brochures and put up posters and banners, they are banned from speaking to the press. "The aim is to ensure equality between wealthy candidates who can afford to pay for advertising in newspapers and those who can't," Shaar said. — AFP

IN IRAQ WAR, HUNDREDS MORE DISPLACED BY ISLAMIC STATE

MAKHMOUR, Iraq: Fighting between Iraqi forces and militants affiliated with the Islamic State group close to Mosul, Iraq's second largest city, has displaced over 2,000 people in the past week. On one recent night, around a hundred people arrived on the outskirts of the town of Makhmour, in Iraq's semiautonomous northern Kurdish region, having fled violence. The journey ended in a long-awaited reunion for some families torn apart by war. Sheikh Matar Kurdi Al-Bijari had left his home in the

city of Kirkuk in 2014 but was forced to leave his wife, daughter and son behind. When they fled to Makhmour in late March, Bijari travelled to meet

"Today is a very happy day for me because I am finally reunited with my wife and my kids. I hadn't seen them for a year and a month," he said, after tearfully hugging his family. Until the beginning of 2015, civilians could move easily between Kirkuk and IS-held areas, but

town of Al-Zab, south of Mosul, for the more recently the front lines have become almost impassable. Bijari said that his tribesmen were being targeted by IS fighters, and that those with family members in the Iraqi army or with Kurdish forces, known as the peshmerga, were singled out. The militants have been moving these families ever deeper into their territory, making it harder to escape.

> Once those fleeing war arrive in peshmerga-controlled areas, they are first vetted. The peshmerga troops have been keeping new arrivals in two fenced-off soccer courts on the outer edge of Makhmour while they carry out security screening, including checking mobile phones for messages. Lt Col Mahdi Younis, a peshmerga officer, said his forces need to ensure there are no IS sympathizers among the displaced civilians. He said that once the checks have been carried out, the new arrivals are moved to a nearby camp. This camp, located in an abandoned youth and sports center, is now home to 2,000

The UN estimates that there are 3.3 million internally displaced people across Iraq. The country has witnessed a surge in violence as government forces battle to contain the Islamic State group, which swept across Irag in 2014 and still holds large swaths of territory in the north and west of the country. The recent arrivals to Makhmour described a harrowing nighttime journey, after families made use of some bad weather and a lull in fighting to escape. Many of them left all their belongings behind or threw them away by the roadside when they could no longer carry them. A few people were separated from their relatives on the way, and appeared in shock at the suddenness of their flight.

Relief

Many were clearly relieved to have left IS territory behind. Men who had just arrived were lighting their first cigarettes with visible impatience. Dakhr Abu Jasim, a 28-year-old who had been in Makhmour for several days, said the first thing he did after arriving here was to get a shave. Under IS's strict interpretation of Islam, smoking is not allowed and men must let their beards grow.

By last Thursday, the rain had stopped and a strong sun was beating down on the families crowded in the soccer courts. Except for a few cabins, there was no cover. "We struggled a lot. We are very tired. This kid was barely walking yesterday. I was pushing him to walk. And this morning he couldn't walk anymore," said Isra Badran, a 22year-old mother of three, pointing toward her five-year-son. Ali, He stood close to her, looking dazed. — AP

MIAMI FUGITIVE ON RUN FOR 20 YEARS FOUND IN NICARAGUA

MIAMI: A fugitive from Miami who has been on the run for almost 20 years is back in federal custody after he was arrested in Nicaragua. Robert Allen Lopez, 49, was arrested on Nov. 14, 2015, and deported to Miami on Saturday by a team of deputy US Marshals. According to Barry Golden, who is a spokesman for the Marshals Service, Lopez was deported because he crossed into Nicaragua by foot and was in the country illegally.

In December of 1995, Lopez pleaded

guilty to federal Medicare fraud charges. Lopez established fake companies that filed false Medicare claims totaling more than \$4.3 million on behalf of patients for services that were unnecessary or never provided. Lopez was released on bail on the condition that he would not leave the area without permission. In 1997, he was indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of failure to appear for sentencing.

Lopez eluded capture in Mexico in 2000. After his son was found wander-

ing the streets of Cancun, Mexico, and taken into custody, a person claiming to be the 10-year old's uncle came to visit. Mexican police identified that person as Lopez after obtaining his fingerprints from a cup. When Lopez fled the country, he took his two children with him but left his wife behind. Miami Dade Police later charged Lopez with interference with the custody of a child. Lopez's son returned to the US in March of 2000 and returned to his mother. Marshals said the other child, a girl, was recovered

before the boy.

Golden said the capture of Lopez was due to the efforts of the State Department, Department of Health and Human Services (who handled the original Medicare fraud investigation) and the Marshals Service. Lopez was originally arrested in Nicaragua by the Nicaraguan Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

"The arrest of Robert Allen Lopez demonstrates the commitment of the US Marshals and our federal, state and local partners to pursue those wanted on an international level," said US Marshal Amos Rojas Jr. in a statement. "Crossing global boundaries to avoid prosecution is no longer a viable option with the substantial resources and law enforcement cooperation in place."

Lopez will appear before a federal magistrate on Monday. According to Golden, Lopez will eventually appear before US District Judge James Lawrence King, who was supposed to sentence him on the federal Medicare charges more than 20 years ago. —AP

SMALL PLANE CRASHES ON CALIFORNIA FREEWAY, HITS CAR, KILLS 1

LOS ANGELES: A small plane crashed on a Southern California freeway Saturday, slamming into a car stopped on the side of the road and killing a woman in the vehicle, authorities said. Five others, including the pilot and his passenger, were injured in the crash on a stretch of Interstate 15 that has been the scene of several plane landings. Witnesses said the single-engine plane appeared to be having problems before it banked west and came down, California Highway Patrol Officer Chris Parent said. One man said he didn't hear the plane's engine as it flew overhead.

The Lancair IV landed on its belly and skidded about 250 feet before striking the rear of a black Nissan Altima sedan that was stopped on the shoulder of the road in San Diego County near Fallbrook. The driver of the car had pulled over to synchronize the Bluetooth device on his phone, Parent said.

The impact crumpled the back of the car, killing a 38-year-old San Diego woman in the back seat and injuring three others in the vehicle. "The plane went completely into the trunk and pushed the rear bumper almost into the rear passenger seat," said John Buchanan, spokesman for the North County Fire Protection District.

Pilot Dennis Hogge, 62, and his passenger, who wasn't immediately named, suffered major injuries, Parent said. The driver

suffered moderate injuries, and his two passengers were expected to survive their injuries. The plane was made from a kit in 2000 by Matthew Nokes, according to Federal Aviation Administration records.

A former major league catcher by the same name landed the same make and model of aircraft on Interstate 15 on Feb. 18, 2000. Nokes told The Associated Press at the time that it was the plane's second flight and the engine quit because of a problem with the oil filter.

He guided the \$500,000 plane to a smooth landing on the busy freeway and taxied off the road. No one was injured. It was not immediately clear if that was the same plane involved in the crash. Nokes, who had an 11-year career in the majors, did not immediately return a call seeking comment.

The freeway is no stranger to unusual landings. Parent said he's aware of three other planes that have come down on that stretch of freeway about 50 miles north of San Diego in the past decade.

The FAA and National Transportation Safety Board will investigate the crash, FAA spokesman Ian Gregor said. The crash caused major backups throughout the day on the freeway that runs from the Mexican border through Las Vegas and Salt Lake City to Canada. —AP

WASHINGTON STATE OPENS 520 BRIDGE

SEATTLE: Thousands of people turned out Saturday for festivities celebrating the opening of the new State Route 520 floating bridge across Lake Washington - so many that the state Department of Transportation declared the event "at capacity" and halted buses that had been expected to shuttle additional people to the structure.

Gov. Jay Inslee cut an orange ribbon Saturday at the middle of the 1.5mile (2.4-kilometer)-long span to commemorate the completion of work, more than 12,000 people participated in a 10K fun run, and a representative of Guinness World Records presented a certificate designating it the world's longest floating bridge - at 7,708 feet (2,349.4 meters), it's about 130 feet (39.6 meters) longer than the old one.

"This is what it's all about - seeing years of public engagement, planning, design and construction all come to fruition," said Roger Millar, acting transportation secretary. "This grand bridge is going to serve our region well for a long, long time." The six-lane bridge, which replaces a four-lane version built in 1963, doesn't fully open to car traffic until later this month - April 11 for westbound traffic and April 25 for both directions. The state says it features heavier, stronger pontoons and anchors that allow the structure to withstand stronger winds and waves; a bus and carpool lane in each direction; a 14-foot (4.2-meter)-wide bike and pedestrian path; and system to collect and treat storm water, which will improve water quality in Lake Washington.

The old bridge is expected to be dismantled by the end of the year. On Saturday, the masses strolled along the car-free pavement and enjoyed views of the lake and the mountains on a beautiful spring day. But it was so crowded that some complained about an hour or more for shuttles to make their way off the bridge, and the lines at the food trucks were formidable.—AP

TRUMP ON DEFENSE AS HE TRIES TO REGAIN MOMENTUM IN WISCONSIN

'THIS POLITICS IS A TOUGH BUSINESS'

EAU CLAIRE: Following one of the worst weeks of his campaign, Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump was on defense Saturday as he kicked off a three-day sprint to Wisconsin's primary. Contenders in both parties crisscrossed the Midwestern state seeking an edge ahead of Tuesday's primaries, none more actively than Trump, who's had a rough week and faces a likely struggle against Texas Sen. Ted Cruz in the state, who has passed Trump in recent Wisconsin polls.

passed frump in recent wisconsin polis.

The Republican race is overshadowed by a persistent effort by Trump's rivals in the campaign and the party to force the nomination fight into the July convention - and by his equivocations on whether he will be loyal to the Republican Party or bolt for an independent candidacy if he feels mistreated. Trump began the afternoon with a rally in the Milwaukee suburb of Racine, where he defended a series of controversial comments in recent days on NATO, abortion and his remark that Japan and South Korea should perhaps be allowed to acquire nuclear weapons.

His regrets

"This politics is a tough business," said Trump. "Because you can say things one way and the press will criticize you horribly. You say it another way and the press will criticize you horribly."

Off the stage, in a more reflective moment, Trump expressed regret that he had retweeted an unflattering photo of rival Ted Cruz's wife, Heidi, paired with a glamorous photo of his own wife, Melania, a former model, as part of a bitter feud between the two men. "Yeah, it was a mistake," he told New York Times columnist Maureen Dowd. "If I had to do it again, I wouldn't have sent it." Cruz sought favor in North Dakota, which is not holding a primary or caucuses in the 2016 Republican race. He addressed Republicans at a state convention that is selecting delegates who will go to the national convention unbound to any of the presidential candidates.

Trump and Ohio Gov. John Kasich sent supporters on their behalf to make the case that they should be backed by North Dakota's delegates at the Cleveland convention in July.

The real competition

The Democratic race between Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders has

grown increasingly bitter, too, though it has not matched the Republican contest for raw hostility. Their attention will quickly turn to an even more consequential contest, in New York on April 19, where the Democratic frontrunner dearly hopes to avoid an upset in the state she served as senator. Sanders, who was born in Brooklyn, can claim New York as his home state.

Sanders urged rally-goers to come out in droves tomorrow. "Here is the political reality," he told a young and pumped-up crowd of thousands on the University of Wisconsin's Eau Claire


the Democratic Party."

MORMON LEADER URGES TOLERANCE

SALT LAKE CITY: Mormon leaders called on members to practice tolerance despite political differences, providing the faith's US members guidance at a church conference Saturday amid a presidential campaign marked by harsh rhetoric and bickering. The faith's leaders also reiterated the belief that the religion is the only true church, and that its leaders are prophets speaking for the Lord. They implored members to be more thoughtful and sensitive toward children from all backgrounds, many of whom don't come from "picture-perfect" families.

In a nod to the religion's international footprint, five of 11 men announced as new members of a second-tier leadership council are from countries outside the United States: Guatemala, Argentina, Italy, Australia and New Zealand. More than half of the 15.6 million members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints live outside the US.

Church President Thomas S. Monson, 88, was in attendance, but he did not give any speeches. He is considered the religion's prophet. The comments on politics came from Kevin R. Duncan, a member of the Quorum of the Seventy. He said people should be wary of resenting others because they belong to another religion, hold opposing political views or even root for a differ-

ent sports team. "Let us all remember that God looketh not upon the color of the jersey or the political party," Duncan said. "In the competitions of life, if we win, let us win with grace. If we lose, let us lose with grace." Mormon leaders don't endorse candidates or parties, but they sometimes weigh in on what they consider crucial moral issues.

This presidential cycle, the church has defended religious liberty after Republican front-runner Donald Trump suggested banning Muslims from entering the US It also renewed calls for an end to culture wars where people stake out extreme positions. Henry B. Eyring, a longtime member of a top church leadership council called the Quorum of the Twelve Apostles, urged members to listen carefully to speeches from Mormon leaders so they can feel closer to the Lord. "This is the only true church," he said.

Neil L. Anderson of the Quorum of the Twelve urged members to embrace all the children of the faith - no matter their family situation. He said the religion has hundreds of thousands of children who live with only one parent or whose parents aren't Mormon.

He said the religion will continue to advocate for families led by married men and women who belong to the faith, but said children are welcome from any situation. "While a child's earthly situation may not be ideal, a child's spiritual DNA is perfect because one's true identity is as a son or daughter of God," Anderson said.

Anderson didn't mention children of gay parents. The church came under fire last November when it announced new rules banning baptisms for children living with a gay or lesbian parent.

Those children are still welcome to attend church services. Church leaders have said the rules were intended to prevent children from being caught in a tug-of-war between teachings at home and church. More than 100,000 Mormons are expected to attend five conference sessions over two days, with millions more watching live broadcasts from their homes. The conference is held twice a year. —AP

However, this is largely due to tighter border controls imposed by countries along the Balkan route,

GREECE IN COUNTDOWN FOR **EU-TURKEY MIGRANT RETURNS**

LESBOS: Greek and EU authorities were putting the final touches to an operation that could send hundreds of migrants back to Turkey today, launching a landmark deal that has been slammed by rights watchdogs.

The operation is set to begin on the Greek island of Lesbos where there are over 3,300 migrants, a term that includes refugees. But details of how the operation will proceed-and who and how many migrants will be transferred-are sketchy and

Greek officials yesterday were tight-lipped. Turkish Interior Minister Efkan Ala said his country had made preparations to receive 500 people on Today, and that the Greeks had given the names of 400."We have been in touch with the Greek authorities and said we could take 500 people and they have given us 400 names. Tomorrow it's possible that this figure could change," Ala was quoted as saying by the Anatolia news agency.

The mobilization could involve other Aegean islands with major refugee and migrant populations such as Chios, where agents of EU border agency Frontex were seen arriving on Sunday, an AFP reporter said. Greek state news agency ANA, in a report that has not been denied by the government, has said the first wave could entail some 750 migrants, who would be sent back between today and Wednesday.

They would be sent from Lesbos to the Turkish port of Dikili, adding that Frontex had chartered two Turkish leisure vessels for the operation, it said. Police sources on Lesbos yesterday said there had been a flurry of last-minute asylum applications by refugees and migrants seeking to avoid expulsion. Under the EU deal, all "new irregular migrants" who arrived in Greece after March 20 face being sent back to Turkeyalthough the deal calls for each case to be

examined individually. In addition, for every Syrian refugee being returned to Turkey from the Greek islands, another Syrian refugee will be will be resettled from Turkey to the EU, with numbers capped at 72,000.

The idea of this is to reduce the incentive for Syrian refugees to board dangerous smugglers' boats to Europe, as they will have hope of being resettled directly from refugee camps in Turkey. But on the Aegean islands themselves, many migrants have complained of not being given sufficient time and access to the asylum procedure. Anas al-Bakhr, a Syrian engineer from Homs, said police marked his date of arrival on Chios as March 20 — the day the EU-Turkey

migration deal nominally took effect-even though he arrived on the 19th. "They said the computers were broken that day", Anas told AFP.

Preparations in Turkey

On the other side of the Aegean, work is underway on a centre to host those sent back to the Turkish tourist resort of Cesme.

Another is being created in Dikili, opposite Lesbos-the island that has handled the bulk of the influx of people fleeing conflict and poverty in the Middle East and elsewhere. Turkish media reports say the Turkish Red Crescent is also preparing to open a refugee camp with capacity for 5,000 people further inland in Manisa.

The EU-Turkey deal is the latest attempt to stem the number of people in search of a new life in Europe. More than a million migrants entered last year, and over 150,000 people have crossed the Aegean Sea to Greece in 2016. The operation to resettle Syrians to Europe under the one-for-one arrangement also starts today. Germany expects to take in a first group of about 35 Syrian asylum seekers from Turkey today, the German interior ministry said yesterday.

Several dozen Syrians are also expected to arrive today in France, Finland and Portugal, according to German government sources. The deal has faced strong opposition from rights groups.

Amnesty International has accused Turkey of illegally forcing groups of some 100 Syrians to return every day, saying the alleged expulsions showed "fatal flaws" in the migrant deal agreed with the EU. Turkey rejects the charge, insisting it still adopts the open-door policy that for the last few years has allowed any Syrian fleeing civil war back home to seek refuge.

There are over 52,000 refugees and migrants currently in Greece, according to official figures. With most facilities already full, authorities are trying to create space for an additional 30,000 people in new camps. Adding to the urgency, sporadic violence has broken out between ethnic migrant groups in the overcrowded camps.

But many migrants are reluctant to move to organized centers, fearing that they will not be allowed to leave. German Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere, quoted by the Tagesspiegel am Sonntag weekly, voiced optimism yesterday that the refugee influx had peaked. But, he suggested, agreements with countries in North Africa may be needed to prevent mass arrivals in future. — AFP

The poll found that 53 percent of people aged 18 to 34 wanted Britain to stay in the European Union, with 29 percent wanting out. In the 35 to 54 age group, 38 percent wanted to stay while 42 percent wanted to leave.

Amongst the over-55s, 30 percent want Britain to remain in the EU while 54 percent want to pull out. Bookmakers currently give odds of around 2/5 for Remain, compared to around 2/1 for Leave, suggesting gamblers believe overall it is more likely Britain will stay in the EU. — AFP

AUSTRIA CLAIMS MUCH OF THE CREDIT FOR EU MIGRANT DEAL

'We played a significant role'

VIENNA: Just weeks ago, thousands of migrants a day were streaming into northern Europe. Now the influx has been dramatically crimped and Austria is claiming much of the credit.

The small country at the heart of Europe traditionally is associated with schnitzel, Mozart and "The Sound of Music." More recently, it has also gained a reputation for a hard-nosed migration stance that has shaped Europe's response to the biggest migrant arrivals since World War II.

Austria's decision to shut down its border the main transit route into the heart of Europe for most refugees - initially caused consternation among many in Europe. But senior Austrian politicians assert the decision helped forge last month's agreement between the EU and Turkey that commits Ankara to start taking back migrants who pay smugglers to make dangerous sea crossings to the Greek islands.

"I believe that we played a significant role in finding a solution for the migration crisis," Austrian Foreign Minister Sebastian Kurz told The Associated Press ahead of the first expected migrant returns from Greece to Turkey today.

The protocol

The premise behind the deal is that Europe will send back to Turkey anyone from any country who doesn't qualify for asylum or has tried to evade a rigorous asylum application process. For every person sent back, EU countries would take in one person confirmed to have made a legitimate asylum request.

Austria - and other eastern European nations argue that their decision to close their borders leading from Greece through the Balkans and into prosperous northern Europe enabled the deal with Turkey to happen by creating new facts on the ground.

Those facts include having over 50,000 migrants pile up in Greece, as borders further north closed and boatloads of people still poured across its vast Aegean Sea border daily from Turkey. The Austrian decision meant there would be no more "waving through" of migrants as they sought to get to Austria, Sweden or

Germany, which alone accepted more than 1 million refugees last year. As the Balkan route shut down, the sufferings of migrants trapped in makeshift camps in northern Greece, notably around the border village of Idomeni, laid bare the scale of the human misery and increased pressure within the EU to act.

"The right measures were taken on the European level (only) after Austria's outcry," Austrian Chancellor Werner Faymann told reporters. Others see a more nuanced picture. Anton Pelinka, a politics professor at Eotvoes Lorant University in the Hungarian capital of Budapest, says it was Hungary that played a big role in the EU's new approach. Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban was arguably the first to reject German-led attempts to allow the migrants free passage through Europe with his migrant quotas and his razor-wire border fences.

"Hungary was in fact the initiator of what then consequently was put into force in the Balkans," he said. Still, Austria's decision to impose daily caps on those seeking asylum at its southeastern border as of Feb. 19 sent ripples of alarm through countries along the migrant route, from Slovenia to Croatia, Serbia and Macedonia, Austrian and Balkan route police chiefs on Feb. 18 called for the migrant flow "to be reduced to the greatest possible extent." A day later, Austria imposed caps both on the number of asylum seekers it would accept daily and overall for the whole year.

Five days later on Feb. 24, foreign and interior ministers from Austria and its southern neighbors made it formal - tightening border controls and announcing that a complete shutdown of the route was looming.

Criticism

The move was initially met by harsh criticism. The EU said Austria's clampdown on asylum seekers contravened international law. Greece recalled its ambassador to Vienna and UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon said the border restrictions "are not in line with international law or with common human decency."But the mood has changed.

While declining to comment on Austria's role in the migrant debate, EU migration spokeswoman Tove Ernst echoed the language coming out of Vienna, saying all members "must commit to ending the 'wave-through' approach to those who indicate an interest in applying for asylum elsewhere."

The move to shut the Balkans route was drastic - but it worked. Figures provided Friday to the AP show the number of new refugee arrivals registered by German police dropped from an average of over 2,000 daily at the start of the year to several hundred from the middle of February. Currently, about 100 people are being recorded each day.

Kurz suggested other EU nations had just been waiting for an opening to fall in line. "The fact that our path was the right one revealed itself after only a few weeks," he said, asserting that all 28 EU nations endorsed an end to the unfettered migration shortly after Macedonia, Serbia and Croatia also shut their borders."I can stand criticism from here and there, particularly when it comes from those who after a few weeks agree to what we suggested," he said. — AP

MASS PROTESTS AGAINST MIGRANTS' PRESENCE IN GREECE, TURKEY

IDOMENI: A plan to send back migrants from Greece to Turkey sparked demonstrations by local residents in both countries Saturday, two days before the deal brokered by the

European Union is set to be implemented. At the same time, migrants stranded at a makeshift camp in this small town on Greece's border with Macedonia staged a protest demanding that the border be opened and that they be allowed to continue their jour-

neys to central and northern Europe. The migrants' continued presence led several dozen local residents to stage a protest Saturday morning. They blocked a road for about an hour to demand the evacuation of more than 11,000 stranded migrants to "transit centers" across the Greek mainland.

"The police know what they must do ... they must be issued orders," said Georgios Georgantas, a lawmaker with the conservative opposition New Democracy party, who joined the protesters. He called for the "immediate" evacuation of the Idomeni camp "using vio-

lence, if necessary." Idomeni residents alleged that some migrants had broken into empty homes in the town and said they no longer felt safe. In the coastal Turkish town of Dikili, hundreds demonstrated against the prospect of hosting people expelled from the nearby Greek islands, especially Chios and Lesbos, where there were over 5,000 migrants on Saturday

Turkey is due to receive the first batch of returned migrants and asylum seekers on Monday. A plan to build a reception center in Dikili is unpopular with locals. "We definitely don't want a refugee camp in Dikili," said the town's mayor, Mustafa Tosun. Demonstrators expressed concern over the impact the EU deal could have on the economy, tourism and security in their town.

The EU-Turkey deal stipulates that those who reach the shores of Greece unlawfully will be returned to Turkey unless they qualify for asylum. The deal aims to break the lucrative smuggling operations that now operate out Turkey.

In Idomeni, more than 200 refugees and migrants staged a protest on a highway linking Greece and Macedonia, demanding that Macedonia open its borders. The protesters blocked trucks from crossing into Macedonia, but not passenger vehicles. In a counterprotest, the truckers blocked the road to other vehicles as well.

Near the camp itself, some migrants have camped on the rail tracks, blocking passenger and cargo traffic for the 13th day in a row.

Quite a few migrants, including war refugees from Syria and Iraq, are still hoping that Macedonia, and other Balkan countries to its north, will open their borders. There are rumors circulating in the camp that a "European summit" today will decide to open the borders, but no such summit is scheduled.

But many others are giving up hope. Among them is Muthanna al Hashemy, 36, a refugee from Irag, who has been waiting for 43 days, along with his wife and two boys, aged 4 and 6. He is getting desperate.

"I do not know what to do. The only solution is to return to my country. Here, the situation is worse than the war...They want us to go to the (transit centers) where it is worse than here. I no longer have any money," he says, adding that he spent "over 2,500 euros" (\$2,800) to get to Idomeni. Still, a glimmer of hope persists. "I will wait until Monday, see what happens and then return to my country," he said. — AFP

POPE ANNOUNCES SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR UKRAINE IN EUROPEAN CHURCHES

VATICAN CITY: Pope Francis on Sunday announced that a special collection would be taken up in all of Europe's Roman Catholic churches on April 24 to raise funds to help the people of Ukraine.

Speaking to tens of thousands of people at the end of a Mass in St. Peter's Square, he said he wanted the collection to be a "gesture of charity that, apart from alleviating material suffering, shows my personal closeness as well as that of the entire Church" to the people of Ukraine.

Violence has intensified recently in eastern Ukraine between government forces and Russian-backed rebels, international monitors

have warned. Implementation of a deal agreed in Minsk last year, which would allow for the lifting of sanctions on Russia, and a lull in violence late last year had raised hopes that the conflict that has killed more than 9,000 people could be resolved soon.

The vast majority of Christians living in Ukraine are Orthodox but there are about a million Roman Catholics and about four million Eastern Rite Catholics who are in unity with Rome.

The pope did not say how the aid would be distributed. There are about 120,000 Roman Catholic parishes in Europe, with the largest number - about 27,000 - in Italy. — Reuters

AUSTRALIA SAYS POSSIBLE MH370 DEBRIS FOUND ON MAURITIUS

SYDNEY: Yesterday Australia's transport minister said new debris found on the Indian Ocean island of Mauritius would be examined to see if it belonged to MH370, just weeks after two Mozambique fragments were linked to the missing flight.

The debris was found on the Mauritius island of Rodrigues by a vacationing couple, news.com.au reported citing Reunion island website Clicanoo. "The Malaysian government is working with officials from

the debris and arrange for its examination," Australian Transport Minister Darren Chester said.

"This debris is an item of interest however until the debris has been examined by experts it is not possible to ascertain its origin." However, it remains unclear which country would examine the debris. Aviation expert Don Thompson told the Australian news website the fragment could be the internal bulkhead from the

Mauritius to seek to take custody of Malaysia Airlines' Boeing 777 business or economy class cabin.

'Almost certainty'

The latest discovery came less than two weeks after Australian and Malaysian authorities said two pieces of debris found in Mozambique were "almost certainly from MH370". Another fragment picked up near Mossel Bay, a small town in Western Cape province in South Africa, would also be analyzed to see if it came from MH370, South African officials said last

Before the latest discoveries, only a wing part recovered from the Indian Ocean island of Reunion, which lies east of Mozambique and neighbors Mauritius, had been confirmed as coming from the jet that disappeared two years ago.

Australia is leading the search for MH370 in the remote Indian Ocean, where the Kuala Lumpur-Beijing flight is believed to have diverted when it disappeared on March 8, 2014 carrying 239 passengers and crew. Chester added that authorities "remain hopeful the aircraft will be found". More than 95,000 square kilometers of the target zone of 120,000 square kilometers has been scoured so far, but no crash site has been found. The governments of Australia, China and Malaysia have said they will end the hunt when the target area is fully searched unless new, credible information emerges. — AFP

JAPANESE WARSHIPS IN PHILIPPINES NEAR THE DISPUTED WATERWAY

Tensions mount

SUBIC BAY FREEPORT ZONE: Two Japanese destroyers and a submarine docked at a Philippine port yesterday near disputed South China Sea waters, where Beijing's increasingly

assertive behavior has sparked global concern. Manila is seeking to strengthen ties with Tokyo as tensions mount over the disputed waterway, almost all of which is claimed by

China. Japanese submarine Oyashio and destroyers JS Ariake and JS Setogiri docked in the Subic port Sunday for a routine visit at a sprawling former US naval base just 200 kilometers from a Chinese-held shoal.

"The visit is a manifestation of a sustained romotion of regional peace and stability and enhancement of maritime cooperation between neighboring navies," Philippine Navy spokesman Commander Lued Lincuna said. The Ariake was equipped with an anti-submarine helicopter, according to an AFP photographer at the scene.

The showcase

The port call came on the eve of war games between the United States and Filipino soldiers in the Philippines, which is seen as a showcase of a long-standing military alliance that the Philippines is counting on to deter China. Seriously outgunned by its much larger rival China, the Philippines has turned to allies like the United States and Japan to upgrade its armed forces in recent years.

In February, Japan agreed to supply the Philippines with military hardware, which may include anti-submarine reconnaissance aircraft and radar technology. Tensions in the South China Sea-through which one-third of the world's oil passes-have mounted in recent months since China transformed contested reefs into artificial islands capable of supporting military facilities. Aside from the Philippines, Vietnam, Brunei, Malaysia and Taiwan also have overlapping claims. Japan and China are locked in a separate dispute over an uninhabited island chain in the East Sea. The Philippines has asked a United Nations-backed tribunal to declare China's sea claims as illegal and the government expects a decision this year. — AFP

INDIAN PRIEST KIDNAPPED IN YEMEN 'COULD BE FREED SOON'

MUMBAI: An Indian priest abducted by gunmen in Yemen last month is safe and could be released soon, a Catholic group said yesterday, quoting the Indian foreign minister.

Father Tom Uzhunnalil was captured from the southern Yemeni city of Aden by gunmen who killed at least 15 people at an old people's home in an attack that was condemned by Pope Francis. The Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (CBCI) said a delegation met Indian Foreign Minister Sushma Swaraj who said the government was working to secure the priest's safe return.

"She has assured us Father Tom is safe and negotiations are on for his release which could happen very soon," said Father Joseph Chinnaiyan, deputy secretary of the CBCI. Media reports last week said the priest was killed by Islamic State militants on Good Friday, although no one has claimed responsibility for last month's attack in which gunmen killed four Indian nuns, two Yemeni female staff members, eight elderly residents and a

Father Chinnaiyan said the reports were inaccurate. Aden has been racked by lawlessness since Hadi supporters, backed by Gulf Arab military forces, drove fighters of the Iranallied Houthi group from the city in July last year. International aid groups have pulled most of their foreign staff from Yemen due to security concerns. — Reuters

The deaths came during rain that started Saturday night. "The death toll from heavy rains has now risen to 24," the spokesman said, from several remote areas.

Poorly-built homes, particularly in rural areas, are most susceptible to collapse during heavy spring rain. Severe weather hits the country every year, with hundreds killed

and huge tracts of prime farmland

destroyed in recent years. During the rainy season last summer, torrential downpours and flooding killed 81 people and affected almost 300,000 people across the country. — AFP

CHINA'S GREY LUXURY MARKET THREATENED BY NEW TAX REGIME

HONG KONG/PARIS: China is raising fees on packages ordered from abroad and cracking down on smugglers who carry in suitcases full of luxury goods, in a concerted effort to encourage shopping at home and squeeze a grey market that shoppers use to avoid tax.

Although Chinese shoppers account for a third of global sales of luxury goods, sales that actually take place in mainland China account for only a fifth. The rest are purchases made abroad-either ordered from overseas websites, bought by Chinese tourists, or smuggled in by "personal shoppers" known as daigou, who fill suitcases with luxury items and sell them back home in person or online.

That costs the Chinese government tax revenue, and also discourages the domestic consumption sector, particularly for higher quality goods, that Beijing has long been trying to boost to rebalance its economy away from exports.

"China wants to attract the outbound purchases back and cultivate a domestic luxury consumption market which is also consistent with the target to develop a consumption driven economy," Yating Xu, an economist for HIS Global Insight said.

Luxury items like the latest Dolce & Gabbana bag can be around 50 percent cheaper in Milan or in Paris than in mainland China, although some brands like Chanel lowered Chinese prices last year to close the gap. Some Chinese also prefer to buy expensive items abroad because they can be more certain the goods are genuine, and can get better choice or service than at home.

Luxury firms have invested in opening boutiques in China, but they sometimes sit idle, potentially damaging their brands. The problem has gotten worse over the past year, according to figures provided by the consultancy Bain & Co, which found that luxury consumption in mainland China fell 2 percent in 2015, even as purchases by Chinese buyers rose 251 percent in Japan, 31 percent in Europe and 33 percent in South Korea.

The parallel market, mostly conducted online, is crowding out bricks-and-mortar shops, said Roth Lai, deputy editorial director at Elle China, speaking at a conference on luxury in Paris this week.

"E-commerce has become really the main driving force in the luxury goods market in China," he said. "But I think the Chinese will continue to buy outside of China for the foreseeable future, until there is a major shift in economic structure in China."

Penalties, taxes

To combat the daigou, the Chinese government last week increased penalties for false declarations and tightened customs controls. Officials are catching more and more Chinese travelers at the airport with suitcases full of luxury goods and slapping taxes on them.

Beijing also said that from April 8 it would increase taxes imposed on a range of goods either imported via the Internet or carried in by daigous. Tariffs on watches ordered from abroad were increased to 60 percent from 30 percent and on jewellery to 15 percent from 10 percent. "We expect an adverse impact on overseas purchases by Chinese daigous and tourists alike," said Exane BNP Paribas analyst Luca Solca.

China has also tightened the use abroad of UnionPay cards, the government-supported payment card network. As of January, there is an annual withdrawal limit at overseas cash machines of 100,000 yuan (\$15,471.49) per card. — Reuters

KERRY SET TO VISIT HIROSHIMA **NUCLEAR MEMORIAL THIS MONTH**

TOKYO: US Secretary of State John Kerry and fellow envoys from the G7, including nuclear powers Britain and France, will visit Hiroshima's Peace Memorial Park this month,

Japan announced. Kerry will be the first US secretary of state to have ever visited the iconic park, where he is set to lay flowers at the memorial dedicated to the victims of the world's first nuclear

attack on August 6, 1945. Japanese Foreign Minister Fumio Kishida said late Saturday: "Foreign ministers from the G7 countries will all visit Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum and offer flowers at the cenotaph for the victims on April 11." The visit will take place on the sidelines of a foreign ministers' meeting this month, where the envoys are scheduled to hammer out the agenda for the G7 summit in May.

US officials are still considering a possible visit to Hiroshima by President Barack Obama during his trip to Japan for the meeting, however, no official announcement has been made. Japan has long urged world leaders to visit Hiroshima and Nagasaki to see the horrors of the atomic bombings and join efforts to eradicate nuclear arms.

In 2008 then House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi laid flowers at the memorial park, as the highest-ever sitting US official to do so. US ambassador Caroline Kennedy and under-secretary for arms control and international security Rose Gottemoeller also attended the Hiroshima memorial service to mark the attack's 70th anniversary last year. The world's first atomic bomb killed about 140,000 people in Hiroshima, including those who survived the explosion itself but died soon after due to severe radiation exposure.

Three days later, the US military dropped a plutonium bomb on the port city of Nagasaki, killing some 74,000 people. Washington has never apologized for the attacks. The bombings are controversial in the United States, where opinion remains divided over whether their use in the closing days of World War II was justified. — AFP

AUSTRALIA OPPOSES TRUMP'S ASIA NUCLEAR POLICY, SAYS PM

SYDNEY: Australia opposes Donald Trump's suggestion that Japan and South Korea should develop nuclear weapons since this would "add considerably" to the risk of regional conflict, Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull said yesterday.

The Republican presidential front-runner had declared he would withdraw US troops from both countries and allow them to develop their own nuclear arsenals. But Turnbull said regional power Australia, a US ally, was "opposed to the further proliferation of nuclear weapons".

"That is absolutely not the view of Australia," the prime minister told Sky News of Trump's nuclear policy comments. "We would not support, in fact we would strenuously oppose, I think, as a global community, the further proliferation of nuclear weapons. "Clearly... it would add considerably to tensions and the risk of conflict in the region."

South Korea and Japan last week offered muted reactions to Trump's comments. There are nearly 30,000 US troops permanently stationed in South Korea and 47,000 in Japan, with little appetite for nuclear weapons in either nations. The White House on Friday said Trump's policy would shatter doctrine held for decades with "catastrophic" consequences. Turnbull in February unveiled a major new investment in Australia's defence capabilities. — AFP

India, Saudis to strengthen 'anti-terrorism' cooperation

RIYADH: Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Saudi King Salman agreed in Riyadh yesterday to strengthen their cooperation in fighting "terrorism" and to facilitate investments. "The two leaders expressed strong condemnation of the phenomenon of terrorism in all its forms," said an Indian foreign ministry statement after their talks. They "agreed to enhance cooperation in counter-terrorism operations" and cyber-security, "including prevention of use of cyber space for terrorism, radicalization and for disturbing social harmony," it added.

The two countries signed a memorandum of understanding on cooperation in intelligence-sharing on money laundry and terrorism financing, said a statement on the official Saudi Press Agency (SPA). Just days ahead of Modi's two-day visit to Riyadh, Saudi Arabia and the US Treasury announced joint sanctions on four individuals and two organizations with alleged links to Al-Qaeda, the Taleban and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) - which India blames for the 2008 Mumbai attacks that killed 166 people.

Among those sanctioned was Saudibased Muhammad Ijaz Safarash, who allegedly provided financial, material or technological support for the Pakistanbased militant group LeT. "We affirm the importance of continued cooperation and coordination with your country's government in the field of fighting terrorism," King Salman told Modi, according to SPA.

Modi arrived in the world's largest crude exporter on Saturday and has held talks with top Saudi officials, his country's

community in the Muslim kingdom, as well as Indian workers and local businessmen. India, which imports around 80 percent of its oil needs, is keen to take advantage of low crude prices by signing overseas deals that will help secure supplies to meet its growing demand.

Indian foreign ministry official Shri Mridul Kumar has said ahead of the visit that almost 20 percent of the South Asian country's crude supplies come from Saudi Arabia and that New Delhi wants to ensure this supply continues. The Indian foreign ministry statement yesterday said that "the two leaders expressed satisfaction at their growing bilateral trade in the

eneray sector."

They agreed "to transform the buyer-seller relationship in the energy sector" to focus "on investment and joint ventures in petrochemical complexes, and cooperation in joint exploration in India, Saudi Arabia and in third countries," it added. They also discussed regional and international developments, including the security situation in West Asia, the Middle East and South Asia, and agreed to bolster defense cooperation and diversify trade. Their investment authorities meanwhile signed a framework agreement to facilitate investments by the private sectors in the two countries. — AFP

Big houses consume below 10,000 kW, said Shaye, adding that according to the government, a majority of homes consume 30 percent above their needs because of cheap prices. The lawmaker said that if consumers cut usage by 30 percent, the power bill will not increase for a majority of citizens.

Shaye said Electricity and Water Minister Ahmad Al-Jassar told the committee he could not provide it with the government's view on the new proposals and that he must discuss it with the Cabinet first. The committee gave the minister until Wednesday to present the government's response, he said.

Member of the committee MP Khalaf Dumaitheer said that the committee informed the minister of its rejection of the government's bill, adding that the minister said he will discuss the issue with the council of ministers. He expected the committee to finalize the issue on Wednesday. If the committee and the government reach an agreement, the issue is scheduled to be debated in the National Assembly on April 12.

COORDINATION WILL STABILIZE OIL: KUWAIT

KUWAIT: Kuwait said yesterday that an agreement on coordination between major OPEC and non-OPEC oil producers at a meeting in Doha in mid-April would help stabilize crude prices. "When there is coordination between major producers in OPEC and non-OPEC countries, it will certainly help to stabilize prices," acting oil minister Anas Al-Saleh told reporters. "We believe that a common agreement on a positive stand will serve (oil) market stability," the minister said.

Saleh said Kuwait, OPEC's fourth-largest producer, would attend the highly anticipated meeting in Qatar, where major producers are to discuss freezing oil production to address a supply glut that has driven down prices. Qatar has said that 12 countries have so far agreed to attend the April 17 meeting, including the world's top crude producers Russia and Saudi Arabia. The United Arab Emirates, non-OPEC Oman and Bahrain, Nigeria, Algeria, Venezuela. Indonesia and Ecuador will also attend.

Saleh said last month that Kuwait would not agree to a

freeze in production unless all major producers, including Iran, accept the output cap. Kuwait, which sits on around 7.0 percent of global crude reserves, is currently pumping 3.0 million barrels per day. Iran has so far rejected attempts to freeze production and demanded an exemption to allow it to boost exports after the lifting of sanctions under its nuclear deal with world powers.

Oil prices tumbled Friday after Saudi Arabia's deputy crown prince Mohamed bin Salman said the kingdom, the world's top exporter, would only freeze output if Iran and other major producers did the same. US benchmark West Texas Intermediate for delivery in May slid \$1.55 (4.0 percent) to \$36.79 a barrel on the New York Mercantile Exchange. Brent North Sea crude for June delivery, the global benchmark, finished at \$38.67 a barrel in London, down \$1.66 (4.1 percent). All 13 OPEC members in addition to major non-OPEC producers have been invited to the talks. Oil prices have plummeted more than 60 percent since mid-2014 partly because of oversupply. — AFP

CEASEFIRE IN 'CURRENCY WAR', **BUT WILL IT LAST?**

truce appears to have emerged in the undeclared global "currency war", but analysts question whether central banks have really given up manipulating exchange rates to prop up their economies. "The currency war is in reality a war between central banks who are battling to support their own interests and taken into account what their rival central banks are doing," said Sylvain Loganadin, an analyst at online foreign exchange broker FXCM. Meanwhile analysts at HSBC bank said they believe "a truce has broken out in the global currency war". "Exhausted by the battle, it seems the ECB has given up the fight to continually engineer higher inflation through a weaker exchange rate. The Bank of Japan has also come to realise the limits of currency war following the failure of a shift to negative rates to foster (yen)

The European Central Bank seems to have thrown in the sponge at its March 10 monetary policy meeting. With global financial markets roiled by volatility in the first two months of the year, the ECB seemed to give up targeting a lower level for the euro, instead announcing new measures to ease access to credit in order to support recovery of the eurozone economy. "Central banks innovate and adjust narrative," noted economists at Barclays bank.

The ECB turned its "emphasis to credit easing and stimulating domestic demand away" from an implicit strategy to weaken the euro while in a speech this past week US Federal Reserve chief Janet Yellen "also surprised markets, albeit in a different way". Instead of emphasizing the strength of the recovery of the US economy, Yellen highlighted global economic and financial risks, with the dollar falling in value as fewer hikes in interest rates are now likely this year.

Secret Deal in Shanghai?

Barclays economists went as far as saying that the ECB and Fed moves, following the turbulent start of the year, "could suggest a potential 'implicit accord' between core policymakers" was made at the Group of 20 meeting in Shanghai at the end of February. For HSBC, the narrow range of the movement of the euro against the dollar means that some market participants now see greater coordination of central bank policy. But if there is such an accord, "why should it be secret", asked Capital Economics economist Julian Jessop.


"If policymakers genuinely thought that exchange rates had moved dangerously out of line with (economic) fundamentals and that the strength of the dollar was becoming a major problem, why not say so?" He noted policymakers have talked publicly of other risks to the global economy, and that a verbal intervention might have been enough to bring the dollar down.

Moreover, coordination is complicated by signs that the interests of central banks are not aligned as the BoJ, ECB and Fed each would like to see their currency weaken against its counterparts. "The aim of devaluing the currency is to boost exports to make up for flagging growth and boost inflation by increasing the price of imports," said market analyst Jasper Lawler at CMC Markets. And given that influencing the exchange rate is an easy means for central banks to achieve their policy objectives, it will be difficult for policymakers to abstain from using it.

Loganadin noted that result wouldn't be desirable. "If currencies weren't controlled any longer by central banks, we'd have market movements similar to those with Bitcoin with periods of intense speculation followed by burst bubbles, which would have a dramatic effect on the real economy with alternating periods of hyperinflation and deflation," said

But the prospect for any truce is at the mercy of China, which still controls its currency. China's central bank "has a tendency to go it alone and adopt surprise measures" that have effects on the United States and Europe, noted Loganadin. That unpredictability from the world's second largest economy is a source of concern for currency traders. —AFP

NEW SIGNS WARN OF MINES IN UKRAINE

anger! Mines! Do not leave the road!" warns a billboard painted with an ominous skull and crossbones on a blood-red background that stands on a roadside in war-torn eastern Ukraine. Though fighting between Kiev's forces and pro-Russian rebels has dwindled after nearly two years, mines scattered across the vital industrial region that is home to some three million people continue claiming lives at an alarming rate.

A March report prepared by the United Nations Human Rights Monitoring Mission in Ukraine said explosive devices had killed 21 people and injured 57 in the preceding three months. In the absence of massive artillery shelling, landmines remain the main cause of civilian casualties, the report said. Ukraine's emergency services report clearing the Donetsk and Lugansk provinces that are partially run by the rebels of more than 44,000 mines and booby traps by the start of December.

But the warring sides and foreign monitors struggle to estimate how many such devices remain. To reduce the number of victims, the International Committee of the Red Cross began installing huge billboards along a sevenkilometre (four-mile) stretch of a road that juts through the no-man's land splitting the two sides' fighters and their respective checkpoints. It has only put up 15 of them for the moment, but locals appear grateful nonetheless. Until now, the only visible warnings appeared on small handmade boards set up mostly by sol-

"These signs are needed," says Olga, a 28year-old nurse who refused to give her last name for security reasons. "They will make this area safer", she said while watching the first billboard being put up in Berezove, a so-called "grey zone" village about 10 km south of the separatists' de facto capital of Donetsk.

Invisible Danger

Once a month, Olga picks up a heavy suitcase and crosses the demarcation line to visit relatives who live in a pro-Western government controlled part of the impoverished east European state. On each journey, says Olga, she fears being maimed or worse by the invisible threat.

Ukraine sign up to a truce and political reconciliation agreement in Feb 2015. That deal has calmed the worst violence but has done little to settle the political future of rebel-controlled lands that run near the Russian border, which militias control. Ukraine says it must deploy its forces along the porous frontier before any political resolution is reached - a seemingly distant goal. In this latest in a series of conflicts to plaque other contested regions of the former Soviet Union, groups like the Red Cross do what they can to help stranded civilians survive.

Lacking De-Mining Efforts

The Red Cross installed its first sign at the end of March in Berezove, where the global humanitarian organisation pinpointed 15 mine blasts in the past six months, killing one civilian. "This is very dangerous territory," Red Cross member Anna Cheptunova says. Cheptunova explains that most casualties occur when buses packed with civilians veer off roads to avoid checkpoints at which vehicles are sometimes forced to wait for hours, forming kilometres-long queues.

The most recent such reported incident killed three people when their minibus tried to get past the checkpoint by driving off into a mine-studded field on Feb 10. The Red Cross intends to put up more billboards in the future south of Donetsk. But some residents say the effort was insufficient and that the two foes should focus on de-mining efforts to make the region safer. "These preventive billboards are a necessity," says 55-yearold Georgy, waiting for his bus near a checkpoint. "But what is even more necessary is for the guys with the guns on both side to start clearing" the war zone, he says. —AFP

PROWLER' LONDON HUNTS 'WIMBLEDON

unning gentleman thieves have seduced romantics from the days of Robin Hood through to Hollywood's heyday - and now London is transfixed by the real-life antics of the "Wimbledon Prowler". The prolific burglar is suspected of carrying out hundreds of break-ins around one of London's most exclusive neighborhoods, making off with assets worth more than £10 million (\$14 million). The quaint, upscale neighborhood of Wimbledon Village in the British capital's smart southwest is sheltered from the hustle of city life, and known mainly for its famous tennis tournament and multi-million pound mansions.

But fear now stalks the leafy streets in the form of the "Wimbledon Prowler", as the light-fingered criminal has been nicknamed by the British press. In a decade of deception, the thief has committed more than 200 burglaries, making mockeries of locks, alarms and security camera systems to pilfer luxury watches, jewellery and cash, detective inspector Dan O'Sullivan told AFP. The intruder's high-profile targets have included German tennis legend Boris Becker and French former Real Madrid and Arsenal footballer Nicolas Anelka, who chased the burglar from his house. His biggest single trophy is believed to be a 1955 Rolex Submariner watch valued at around £500,000.

Disciplined Professional

"In the UK there is no one that gets close to him, in terms of the period of time that he's been offending and the financial gain," said O'Sullivan. "The law of averages says that you're going to make a mistake one day,

but we've never actually got close to him, which indicates he's very good. He's disciplined."That the crook remains at large is not for the lack of trying, with media reporting that police have even hidden in trees to catch him in the act.

Starved of solid leads, Scotland Yard launched an appeal for witnesses in March after a particularly productive period for the

of medium height and is described as athletic, agile, organized, disciplined and likely knowledgeable about police investigation techniques. The thief leaves no evidence behind such as fingerprints and is aware of the location of surveillance cameras, hiding his face with his hand. O'Sullivan did not rule out the possibility that the hunted man could be a former soldier, given his self-control and attention to detail.

'Thrill of the Chase'

"This individual seems to be one of the 10 percent of burglars who plan a crime," said retired policeman Calvin Beckford, who now operates The Crime Prevention Website, the largest open-source online resource of its kind in Europe. "This guy is clearly very cautious, is security-aware and spends time making observations, minimizing his chances of being seen and detected," he told AFP, advising Wimbledon residents

to review their security systems. O'Sullivan believes that the felon is motivated by more than just money, saying he was probably seduced by the "kick, the thrill of doing it". None of the burglaries have led to physical harm, with one victim telling AFP: "He comes and goes, but so far there's never been any evidence of any violence." "We don't think he's lifethreatening, we don't lose sleep but we hope that he'll be caught," the victim added - but that may be a while in coming. "He's now gone to ground," explained O'Sullivan. "We're just waiting for him to come again and when he comes again, we'll be ready for him. "Like him, for us, it's the thrill of the chase because one day, we're going to get lucky." —AFP

RUSSIA'S KUKSENKOV TEST POSITIVE FOR MELDONIUM

MOSCOW: European champion gymnast Nikolai Kuksenkov has become the latest Russian sportsman to test positive for the banned drug meldonium, local media reported yesterday. "The sample which Kuksenkov gave for testing on March 15 showed the presence of the traces of meldonium," the Allsport agency quoted Russia's national gymnastics team head coach Valentina Rodionenko as saying. Rodionenko added that the gymnast took meldonium last year, before the drug has been included into the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) prohibited list on

> January 1. The 26-year-old Kuksenkov, who competed for Ukraine before 2012, finished fourth in the all-round event at London Olympics. He won the 2014 European championship and was the top Russian gymnast at the 2015 World Championships, finishing sixth in the all-around after joining the Russian team. Meldonium was propelled into the headlines last month after Russian tennis star Maria Sharapova announced she had tested positive for the drug at the Australian Open in January. Since then, a string of

Russian athletes, including Olympic swimmer Yulia Efimova and figure skating Olympic champion Yekaterina Bobrova have admitted to testing positive for the drug. —AFP

F1 DEFERS DECISION ON **NEW QUALIFYING SYSTEM**

SAKHIR: Formula One organizers and teams will vote on an all-new qualifying format on Thursday after a meeting yesterday in which the sport's governing body, the FIA, and commercial chief Bernie Ecclestone ruled out teams' request to immediately return to the old system. The FIA put forward a new format and while participants in the meeting wouldn't publicly confirm what it was, Red Bull team principal Christian Horner said one option was for "an aggregate time of two laps rather than a single lap but it needs to be properly thought out."

The current rolling-elimination format - in which the slowest driver is eliminated every 90 seconds - was used in Australia and Bahrain but was heavily criticized due to fan confusion and lack of on-track action. Teams had resolved after the Australian Grand Prix to return to the 2015 format but when it went to the F1 Commission, they couldn't reach the requisite unanimous agreement to change rules midseason.—AP

FORMER MILAN CAPTAIN **CESARE MALDINI DEAD**

MILAN: Football is in mourning following the death of former AC Milan and Italy legend Cesare Maldini at the age of 84. In a statement yesterday, the club remembered Maldini as "a man who was destined for immense achievements at Milan." His son Paolo followed his footsteps to play at Milan, while a grandson, Christian, plays for the under-19 team Milan Primavera. Tributes have been flooding in from across football. "A great man has left us, a true legend of Italian football," Italian Football Federation President Tavecchio said. "He made history first as player and then as head coach. "He was the first Italian ever to lift the European Cup; he then contributed to the development of countless Azzurri talents as a manager, always fulfilling his position with exemplary professionalism. He embodied perfectly the essence of the national head coach role." There will be a minute's silence before every league game today, while Milan players are wearing black armbands in their match against Atalanta. DAY HEADS STELLAR CAST TO SET UP A MASTERS SPECIAL

by a stellar cast, then the Masters is shaping up as one of the best in recent memory with all of the game's leading players having produced superb form over the past three

World number three Rory McIlroy is the only player ranked in the top six who has not claimed at least one tournament win so far this year, though he came close with a tie for third at the WGC-Cadillac Championship in Miami last month.

Second-ranked American Jordan Spieth, the reigning Masters champion, triumphed at the Hyundai Tournament of Champions in January while red-hot Australians Jason Day and Adam Scott have each landed two PGA Tour titles over the past five weeks.

World number four Bubba Watson, a double winner at Augusta National, clinched the Northern Trust Open in February and his good friend, fifth-ranked fellow American Rickie Fowler, won the European Tour's Abu Dhabi Championship in January.

"Everyone is running in good form," Northern Irishman McIlroy said while preparing for the April 7-10 Masters, the first of the year's four major championships. "And they're all good champions, a few of them are Masters champions. "You want your game rounding into form and playing to the best of your abilities this time of year. I feel like I'm close. "I'm probably not quite where they are, and I haven't had the confidence of getting a win this year, but I feel like it's close." Aged just 26, McIlroy has already claimed four major titles and next week he will be bidding for his first Green Jacket at the picturesque 'Cathedral of Pines' in Georgia, to complete a career grand slam of golf's four blue riband

And he likes his progression at the Masters where he tied for eighth in 2014 before finishing a career-best fourth last year. "I'm very positive and optimistic going back to Augusta because the last few years I've improved my performance there," said McIlrov. "Last year, I played the golf course pretty much the way I wanted to. Had a good weekend. Played the par-fives very well ... it worked out pretty well."

RED-HOT DAY

World number one Day is the game's hottest player, having won six times in his last

AUGUSTA: If a standout movie is guaranteed 13 starts, and the long-hitting Australian will be difficult to beat at Augusta National where he tied for second in 2011 and placed third in 2013. "It's been good momentum for me, confidence-wise, over the last two weeks," Day said after following his victory at the Arnold Palmer Invitational with further success at the elite WGC-Dell Match Play in Texas.

"But I can't get comfortable with how I'm playing right now, I can't get lazy, because I've got to understand that what I'm doing is working. "So I've got to keep working on the things that have caused me to win over the last two weeks, keep doing that and then stay focused and hopefully put on the Green Jacket."

Short game wizardry and the ability to minimise three-putts are musts for any would-be Masters champion at an iconic venue renowned for its lightning-fast, severely contoured greens. A comfort factor at Augusta National is another significant factor so expect defending champion Spieth, 2013 winner Scott and left-hander Watson, who wound up with the coveted Green Jacket in 2012 and 2014, to flourish next week.

"No disrespect to any other event, but I absolutely love that golf course," Spieth, 22, said of Augusta National where he triumphed by four shots last year after matching Tiger Woods' tournament record low of 18-under 270 for 72 holes.

"It is my favourite golf course in the world, it's just an easy week. The roars, the echoes, the memories, the history from watching it growing up, being on the same golf course.

"I expect to play well on a course I feel very comfortable on," said Spieth, whose form has been inconsistent since his victory at the Hyundai Tournament of Champions in January. American Watson, who is renowned for his prodigious length off the tee and brilliant shot-making, also loves the picture-postcard layout at Augusta National. "It's a special place, it's the perfect golf course," said Watson. "It gives me goosebumps every time I come down Magnolia Lane (to reach the clubhouse). It just gets you excited, makes us feel like a kid again. You become energised." Other likely contenders include long-hitting American Dustin Johnson, his compatriot Phil Mickelson who will be seeking a fourth Masters victory, 2013 U.S. Open champion Justin Rose of England and rising Japanese talent Hideki Matsuyama. —Reuters

TEXAS: WWE bills WrestleMania as its Super Bowl. contests where the outcome is known in advance. WrestleMania is always the biggest, baddest fight

night of the year - and tonight, maybe of all time. Forget the Final Four. The true extravaganza this weekend in Texas is WrestleMania.

WWE is headed to a stadium worthy of a Super Bowl, and has lofty expectations of stuffing 100,000 fans inside AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas. The roughly five-hour card is highlighted by three matches worthy of the main event. "Triple H" Hunter Hearst Helmsley defends the WWE world heavyweight championship against Roman Reigns; former UFC champion Brock Lesnar fights Dean Ambrose in a no-holds barred street fight; and Shane McMahon takes on The Undertaker in a Hell

in the Cell match. "I love being in the ring, I always have," Lesnar said. "I believe somewhere deep down when God created me that I was to be a performer in some way, shape or form, whether it was in the octagon, the wrestling mat or the squared circle." WWE has high hopes that not only will WrestleMania 32 top the 93,173 fans at WrestleMania III in 1987 and set the company's attendance mark, but that it can showcase the grandest card of all time.

Just like in sports, injuries fractured chairman Vince McMahon's fantasy story lines.

Superstars John Cena, Seth Rollins and Randy Orton will all miss the show. Daniel Bryan, who won the WWE championship two years ago at WrestleMania, retired this year because of lingering effects of concussions. Sting, in one of the main bouts last year, is the headliner at the WWE Hall of Fame induction ceremony on Saturday night. Even undercard wrestlers like Luke Harper, Neville, Nikki Bella and Tyson Kidd are out with injuries.

SHOW GOES ON

It's akin to the Golden State Warriors losing Steph Curry, Draymond Green and Klay Thompson right before the playoffs. But the show goes on.

Not unlike at the college basketball Final Four in Houston, there are benchwarmers (The Social Outcasts), bricks (a potential street fight weapon), flops (paging Ric Flair), jumpers (Kalisto's ring entrance), even big 3s (The New Day). Every good game needs The Rock.

Dwayne Johnson takes a break from filming his latest blockbuster to return to an unspecified role at WrestleMania. He had UFC star Ronda Rousey by his side last year in a verbal smackdown with Triple H and Stephanie McMahon that had fans clamoring for some sort of match at this year's WrestleMania. Perhaps on Sunday, Johnson will return to aid his real-life cousin Reigns and layeth the smackethdown on some bad guys.

"Been working on a surprise or two for months now for the most important part of the show - the fans," Johnson wrote on an Instagram post.

But each saucy storyline needs a twist, and maybe Reigns ending the show with his finishing spear on Johnson and holding the title belt high over his head as 100,000 fans boo him could become his one shining moment. It's fantasy booking for sure, so don't bet on that finish.

The actual matches, though, are fair game. An online gambling company based in Canada, Bovada, lists Reigns at minus-700 to top Triple H and has Kevin Owens and The New Day among the other favorites on the card. Such odds aren't offered in Las Vegas, which prohibits betting on

For fans watching on TV, WWE makes the show available on its own network for \$9.99 a month and for \$59.95 on pay-per-view - and new subscribers will get WrestleMania for free as part of a monthlong trial at WWENetwork.com. The Hall of Fame ceremony and a WrestleMania kickoff show includes the Andre the Giant Memorial Battle Royal as part of the weekend's programming.

A win and they get to tee off at Augusta National next week. The 38-year-old Herman shot a 5-under 67 Saturday to position himself for a breakthrough. "There's a lot to play for tomorrow," said the pro from Cincinnati, whose best finish this season has been a 10th-place tie. "I had a couple of good par saves, especially on the last hole. I'm committed to going to the first tee (Sunday) and hitting that first fairway. I've got to ty to not put any extra pressure on myself."

Lovemark, 28 and a former NCAA champion at USC whose professional career was derailed by major back surgery, wasn't able to build on his fast start, which saw him birdie three of the first four holes. He stayed in the hunt with a 70 after opening rounds of 67 and 68. "My confidence is good," Lovemark said. "I've got to keep doing what I've been doing. It's going to be a tough battle tomorrow. It'll be a shootout."

Herman and Lovemark were at 11 under par through 54 holes and just a stroke ahead of Henrik Stenson, Dustin Johnson and Russell Hensley. The Swede Stenson, No. 7 in the current world ranking, posted the day's best round with a 66 after also birdieing three of the first four holes. Henley had a 68 Saturday and Johnson a 70. "The first two days I've hit the ball quite nicely but haven't been putting well," Stenson said, "so I worked again yesterday afternoon on that. I got it going a bit better today. I was more comfortable, found some lies and made a couple of beauties out there."

FIRST MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIP

The two players ahead of Stenson in the world ranking, No. 2 Jordan Spieth and No. 5 Rickie Fowler, remained in contention at 6 under and 7 under, respectively, after both carding 70s.

The 22-year-old Spieth, who stayed alive with three birdies on the back side, lost in a three-way playoff here last spring, then went on to win the Masters in resounding fashion, leading start to finish for his first major championship. "I felt like I played well," said Spieth, who also won the 2015 US Open but has struggled with his consistency over the last several weeks. "We had some unreal wind flips on the first six, seven holes, and we were on the wrong end of about six in a row. It's really tough to stay patient through that.

"I'm playing really, really solid golf. But it just hasn't come through in a (round of) minus 6 or minus 7. Hopefully that means we're saving them for tomorrow - or next week." Another shot back at 9 under was Roberto Castro, who also scored 70 and is trying to become the first Houston-born player to win the Houston tournament.—AP

FORMULA ONE QUALIFYING FORMAT REMAINS UNDECIDED

MANAMA: Formula One teams and stakeholders failed to agree a fix for the sport's failed new qualifying format at the Bahrain Grand Prix yesterday and agreed instead to go away and consider a compromise by next Thursday. "No decision has been made, we haven't reached the conclusions on how we want to continue yet," said Mercedes motorsport head Toto Wolff after an hour and a half long meeting at the Sakhir circuit that hosts the season's second race. Team bosses said various new formats were discussed, as well as staying with the current one, but there would be no going back to 2015 qualifying because both the governing FIA and commercial rights holder were opposed. "It's not on the table," Wolff said of going back to the 2015 format, a move that the teams had proposed unanimously after the new system was panned on its debut in Australia on March 19.

Williams deputy-principal Claire Williams said there was a belief that "just going back to 2015 will create more confusion than is necessary."

The new elimination format, which sees drivers knocked out at timed intervals during the three sessions, was introduced hurriedly before the start of the season in a bid to add excitement and shake up starting grids. Instead, drivers have been eliminated while sitting in the garages in the final stage rather than battling for pole on track as in the past.

The situation has been a major talking point of the season so far, triggering uproar on social media and dominating much of the talk in the

"They (the FIA and Ecclestone) said that 2015 was not acceptable to them as it was not good enough. We have to just acknowledge that," said Wolff, who added that teams felt the sport could not afford any more experiments. Red Bull principal Christian Horner said a new proposal had been presented by the FIA but would not give details. "It just needs a bit more investigation perhaps with an aggregate time of two laps

rather than a single lap," he told reporters. He swerved a question about whether the situation was more to do with a 'power play' over who calls the shots in the increasingly-troubled

"The bottom line is, if we don't agree to a compromise then we are stuck with what we've got and I think everyone agrees that what we've got isn't right," said Horner. Former world champion Niki Lauda, who attended the meeting as non-executive chairman of the Mercedes F1 team, told Reuters all options had been discussed. "We went forward and backward and then we said we have to stop now because the race is on," said the Austrian. "Next Thursday we are going to see what is going to happen." Any change to the 2016 regulations needs to be approved unanimously by teams. —Reuters

CHIEFS BEAT BRUMBIES TO GO TOP IN SUPER RUGBY

WELLINGTON: Coach Dave Rennie says fitness has played a crucial role in the form which has carried the Hamilton-based Chiefs top the Super Rugby table after the weekend's sixth round. The Chiefs beat the ACT Brumbies 48-23 on Saturday - scoring six tries to two and taking a bonus point to take top spot, two points clear of compatriots the Highlanders and six points above South Africa's Stormers, who had a sixth

Seven time champions the Crusaders moved up to share the same rung of the ladder as the Stormers after winning backto-back matches in South Africa, beating the Lions 43-37 on Friday.

But the Chiefs have now set the benchmark in the tournament, racking up points on the field and air points elsewhere. Saturday's win at Canberra was their fourth in succession, after a second round loss to the Lions, and they have now won matches in South Africa, Argentina, New Zealand and Australia in successive weeks, traveling more than 30,000 kilometers.

They beat the Kings 58-24 in South Africa in round three, the Jaguares 30-26 in Argentina in round four, the Western Force 53-10 in Hamilton in round five and inflicted the heaviest-ever home defeat on the Brumbies on Saturday. That comes to 189 points in their last four matches at an average of 47 points per match.

The feature of their win in Canberra was once again the quality of their attacking play, their ability to execute at pace and the constant and willing support play which allows them to string together long and complex try-scoring movements.

"I think our support play and our ability to keep the ball alive has been massive and a lot of that comes down to our conditioning as well," Rennis said. "I think Phil Heatley, our trainer, and his team have done an amazing job.

"We are a very fit side. We have been pretty clinical in those last parts to storm home. We're really happy with the attitude and the work ethic." Saturday's match was

also typical of the Chiefs' recent performances in that they scored the majority of their points in the second half as their opponents tired. They led 20-13 at halftime, then ran in four more tries after halftime as the Brumbies weakened, showing the effects of their recent return from South Africa. The Brumbies tried to dominate the match through the strength of their set piece, the effectiveness of Wallabies David Pocock and Scott Fardy at the breakdown and through the reliability of their defense. They had the best defensive record in the tournament coming into Saturday's match but the Chiefs blew that away with flyhalf Aaron Cruden, fullback Damian McKenzie and center Charlie Ngatai unpicking the

The scale of the Brumbies defeat was made greater when Pocock, their key player, was cited after the match for grabbing a Chiefs player around the neck. After topping the table with three wins in their first three matches, the Brumbies have now lost two of their last three to drop back to fifth, though they retain the lead in the Australian conference.

All four New Zealand teams in action at the weekend were winners. The Highlanders briefly moved to the top of the table when they beat the Western Force 32-

MEDVEDEVA, 16, WINS WORLD TITLE WITH RECORD FREE SKATE SCORE

BOSTON: Sixteen-year-old Evgenia Medvedeva started giggling when she learned her free skate score at the world championships had set a record. Then she summed it up in English: "Wow."

The Russian teen capped a dominant debut season Saturday with a world title, earning 150.10 points to break Yuna Kim's record from the 2010 Olympics. Medvedeva moved up from third after the short program to add to her Grand Prix Final and European titles.

American Ashley Wagner skated last and sent the home crowd into a frenzy with a personal best score that moved her from fourth to second, the first U.S. woman in a decade to win a medal at worlds. Another Russian teen, Anna Pogorilaya, took bronze. American Gracie Gold, who led after the short program, fell on her opening triple-triple combination to drop to fourth.

Medvedeva looked a bit hesitant during Thursday's short program in her first senior worlds. But she was captivating from the start Saturday. She landed seven triple jumps with never a hint of trouble, throwing an arm above her head on many of them. "I won't realize quickly I won today because one year ago I was still skating juniors," she said through a translator.

It was a performance both youthful and mature at the same time. The program opens with Medvedeva peering out into the crowd with a look of wide-eved wonder.

When it was over, she thrust both fists into the air in triumph. "Actually I don't really have any emotions right now - I left everything on the ice," she said afterward. Sitting in the kiss-and-cry area, the teenager came back out. She bopped her head to the music as she waited for her scores, squeezing her eyes shut and clutching a stuffed animal tight as the marks were about to be announced.

She finished with a total of 223.86 points, following in the footsteps of Adelina Sotnikova, who won the Olympic gold medal at age 17 in 2014, and Elizaveta Tuktamysheva, who won last year's

No American woman had finished on the podium at worlds since Kimmie Meissner took gold and Sasha Cohen bronze in 2006. Even with Gold's mistakes, her score guaranteed that the drought would end - it was just a question of whether it would be Gold or Wagner.

Wagner had the crowd shrieking from the moment she landed her triple flip-triple toe loop combination, and the powerhouse program to the "Moulin Rouge" soundtrack earned her a big score for choreography and expression despite two under-rotated jumps. She received 142.23 points for 215.39 total.

As the music ended, her jaw dropped in exhilaration, an ending that couldn't have been more different from the "horrific experience" the last time she competed in Boston. At nationals in 2014, she came in as the two-time defending champion then fell twice in her free skate to finish a distant fourth. With Wagner still haunted by those memories earlier this week, best friend Adam Rippon - who went on to finish sixth in the men's competition Friday reminded her that in 2014, she was out of shape, overweight and under-trained.

NOT ANYMORE

"Because of 2014, I'm sitting here today," Wagner said. She was still selected for the 2014 Olympic team because of her previous successes, but the debate about whether she deserved the berth in Sochi stung.

"I have so many people that for so many parts of

my career say this has been given to me; I don't deserve this," she said.

"The fact that I have a world silver medal because of something I did, not because of something everybody else didn't do," Wagner added, "that is so sweet."

Skating after Gold, Wagner could tell from the crowd's reaction that a mistake had occurred. She realized there was an opening for a medal but quickly banished the thought from her mind. There's a picture on a wall at TD Garden of the podium from the 2014 U.S. Championships -Wagner is cropped out of it. Now she'll forever be in all the photos from the 2016 worlds, a feat she achieved at the age of 24, when many skaters have retired. "It definitely gets harder. I see this one over here," she said, motioning to Medvedeva, "do long program run-throughs with triple-triples on the end of every combination, and I just think, 'Oh, to be 16 again.' Then I remember that at 16 I couldn't do that." Pogorilaya, 17, was the least accomplished of the three Russians coming in, finishing third behind Medvedeva and Elena Radionova at both the national championships and European Championships. But she skated two clean programs in Boston to again finish third - this time against a much deeper field. She received 139.71 points for 213.69 total. Even after her fall, Gold still had a chance to pass Pogorilaya and secure a medal. But she also did a double lutz instead of planned triple and lost potential points because of the edge on her triple flip takeoff. She earned 134.86 points for 211.29 total. "I feel really ashamed of how I skated and I want to apologize to my country and to the crowd here - there's really no excuse for it," a dismayed Gold said later. "It just shows that I'm not up there with the rest of the world. ... I still have hopes for the 2018 Olympics, but we'll have to step back and re-evaluate what's realistic for my future skating." —AP

KENYA'S KOTUT WINS PARIS MARATHON

PARIS: Kenya's Cyprian Kotut won yesterday's 40th edition of the Paris marathon, adding to his victory in the half-marathon here less than a month ago.

Kotut, 24, finished in an official time of 2hr 07min 11sec, well short of Kenenisa Bekele's course record from two years ago, but comfortably clear of his previous personal from his debut in Milan last year. Kotut was one of eight runners in contention after 35 kilometres, before Ethiopia's Gebretsadik Abraha upped the pace heading into the final 4km. Kotut then pulled clear shortly afterwards and held off his rivals as he cruised across the line unchallenged, with fellow Kenyans Laban Korir and Stephen Chemlany joining him on the podium. "I wasn't too sure if I needed to speed up or not because I still don't really know the course layout. I simply planned to beat my own personal record," said Kotut, competing in just his second marathon. There were still some really strong guys, I didn't expect to be as far ahead."

Visiline Jepkesho, also of Kenya, claimed the women's title in 2hr 25min 53sec, ahead of Ethiopian pair Gulume Chala and Dinknesh Tefera. Jepkesho actually ran a slower time than when she finished third in last year's race and was almost five minutes behind the course mark set by Boru Tadese of Ethiopia in 2013. Security was on high alert in the French capital following terrorist attacks in Paris and Brussels, but Sunday's race, which according to organisers featured just over 46,000 runners, took place without incident in sunny conditions. —AFP

BENN BROTHERS SCORE IN Dallas' 3-2 win over Kings

LOS ANGELES: Jordie Benn scored the tiebreaking goal with 4:58 to play, as the Dallas Stars rallied from a third-period deficit to assert their Western Conference supremacy with a 3-2 victory over the Los Angeles Kings on Saturday. Benn scored his first goal since December 21 after Patrick Eaves tied it early in the third. Jamie Benn also scored his 41st goal for the Stars, who claimed a lateseason meeting of division leaders. Coach Lindy Ruff won his 700th career game as Dallas (48-22-9) moved four points ahead of St. Louis atop the Central Division and eight points ahead of Los Angeles (46-27-5) in the conference standings. Jeff Carter scored his fifth goal in four games and Jonathan Quick stopped 36 shots for the Kings, who have lost

PENGUINS 5, ISLANDERS 0

The Penguins clinched a playoff berth behind Matt Murray's 23 saves for his first NHL shutout. Surging Pittsburgh improved to 45-25-8 with its fifth straight win and has outscored opponents 25-10 in that stretch. The Penguins made the postseason for the 10th straight year and solidified their grip on second place in the Metropolitan Division. WINDIES STUN AUSSIES TO CLAIM WOMEN'S T20 CROWN

KOLKATA: Powerful half-centuries from Hayley Matthews and skipper Stafanie Taylor fired the West Indies to their maiden women's World Twenty20 crown in a thrilling last-over win against Australia in yesterday's final in Kolkata.

Chasing a competitive 149 for a win against the three-time champions, West Indies rode a blistering 120-run opening stand between Matthews (66) and Taylor (59) to triumph with three balls to spare.

The Windies won by eight wickets at the Eden Gardens stadium as they picked up their first win against Australia at their ninth attempt. "Words can't explain what I'm feeling right now. Means so much for us and especially the people of the Caribbean," said Windies wicketkeeper Merissa

Player of the match Matthews and Taylor, who looked determined from the word go, acquired 16 runs off the sixth over, including a

humongous six from Matthews.

A destructive Matthews clobbered three sixes and six boundaries during her 45-ball blitz that made the Aussie bowling attack appear pedestrian. Taylor played a more sedate but commanding innings to lead the Windies to an historic title after three previous failed semifinal attempts. Leg-spinner Kristen Beams got Mathews caught at mid-wicket in the 16th over and 18 balls later Rene Farrell saw the back of Taylor but the wickets only proved to be minor hiccups on the Windies' road to victory. Wild celebrations erupted from the Caribbean dugout as Britney Cooper hit the winning runs to script a new chapter in Windies women's cricket. The Caribbean women danced with their male counterparts, who play England in the men's final later.

The West Indies men can now complete a rare hat-trick after the Under-19 boys lifted the youth World Cup in February.

Earlier after electing to bat, skipper Meg Lanning and Elyse Villani helped Australia post 148 for five against a sloppy West Indies fielding display. The Aussies lost opener Alyssa Healy early but a 77-run second wicket partnership between Lanning (52) and Villani (52) set the tone for a formidable score.

Villani's 37-ball knock was laced with nine fours as she and Lanning were helped by some shoddy West Indies fielding as captain Taylor juggled seven bowlers.

Medium-pacer Deandra Dottin was the pick of the Windies bowlers with two wickets, those of Villani and Ellyse Perry, the latter of whom chipped in with 28 runs off 23 balls including the only two sixes of the Aussie innings.

"Full credit to the West Indies they came out with the bat, did not quite get the result we wanted," Lanning said afterwards. —AFP

AFRIDI QUITS CAPTAINCY, WANTS TO CONTINUE PLAYING TWENTY20S

ISLAMABAD: Shahid Afridi stepped down from the captaincy of Pakistan's Twenty20 team yesteray, but decided to continue playing the shortest format of the game. "Today I wish to inform my fans in Pakistan and all over the world that I am relinquishing the captaincy of the T20 Pakistan team of my own volition," Afridi said in a statement.

"For me it was great honor to lead my country in all the three formats of the game." Afridi, 36, was criticized for the team's poor performance at the World Twenty20 where Pakistan lost three of its four group matches that included defeat against arch rival India. Pakistan's solitary win came against Bangladesh, which qualified for the Super 10 stage.

Team officials also questioned Afridi's leadership at the World Twenty20 with manager Intikhab Alam saying in his tour report that the captain was "absolutely clueless."

Afridi said after losing the last group match against Australia at Mohali that he was under a lot of pressure at the World Twenty20 and felt he was not the right man now to lead Pakistan. Last year after the World Cup, Afridi had quit playing ODIs and had said he will quit T20s after the World Twenty20.

However, he made a U-turn earlier this year, saying he is under huge pressure from his family and friends to continue playing T20s. "I would also like to inform that InshaAllah (god willing) I intend to continue to play the game for my country and league cricket etc., and request my fans for kindly keep praying and supporting me for my best future performances for Pakistan (as a player); and in all other arenas of the game, world over," Afridi said in his statement. Afridi led Pakistan in 43 T20s, winning 19 and losing 23. He replaced Mohammad Hafeez as T20 captain in 2014. —AP

Premier League clubs hit out at doping claims

LONDON: Top English football clubs, including Premier League leaders Leicester City, have all angrily denied a newspaper report that a doctor who prescribed performance-enhancing drugs treated their players.

Leicester, defending champions Chelsea and Arsenal were cited in a Sunday Times report in which London-based private doctor Mark Bonar was secretly filmed talking about providing professional athletes with banned substances. All three clubs have strongly denied the allegations.

"Leicester City Football Club is extremely disappointed that The Sunday Times has published unsubstantiated allegations referring to players from clubs including Leicester City when, on its own admission, it has insufficient evidence to support the claims," the East Midlands side said in a statement.

Chelsea were equally vehement, saying: 'Chelsea Football Club has never used the services of Dr Bonar and has no knowledge or record of any of our players having been treated by him or using his services."

Fellow London club Arsenal also issued a strident statement, slamming "false claims without foundation" and adding: "We strictly adhere to all guidelines set by the World Anti-Doping Agency and our first-team players participate in approximately 50 random drugs tests during each football season. "None of our players has

ever failed such a test." The Sunday Times, which has been at the heart of several doping exposes involving international athletics over the last 12 months, conducted an undercover operation on anti-ageing doctor Bonar. The 38-year-old medic claims to have had a network of "secret clients".

The broadsheet said Bonar named athletes from several different sports. Those contactedbut not named-by the paper either denied being treated by him or declined to comment.

The newspaper was quick to add they had no independent evidence that he treated the unnamed players.

BANNED TREATMENTS

Bonar, who was filmed covertly, is heard telling reporters he had also worked with an England cricketer, British Tour de France cyclists, a British boxing champion, tennis players and martial arts competitors.

"In the past six years he has treated more than 150 sports people from the UK and abroad variously with banned substances such as erythropoietin (EPO), steroids and human growth hormone, and the sports performance improvements were phenomenal," the report said.

In the newspaper's footage, Bonar is filmed saying: "Some of these treatments I use are banned on the professional circuit. "It's how you do it," he said, adding: "You want to do it offcycle or between races.

"The truth of the matter is drugs are in sport." UK Anti-Doping (UKAD), the agency responsible for protecting British sport from drug abuse, confirmed they were aware of Bonar two years ago, but said they had no power to investigate him. UKAD said it interviewed a sportsman in April and May 2014 who, in hoping to reduce his sanction, provided them with more than 100 names, 69 of which related to sport.

UKAD said it could only investigate athletes and their entourage (including medics) who fall under a sporting governing body.

It added that the General Medical Council (GMC), which controls Britain's register of doctors, could investigate possible medical malpractice but after assessing the information it had, UKAD said it did not believe there were grounds to refer the case. The GMC said the allegations were serious and it would investigate them "as a matter of urgency".

PROBE LAUNCHED

In response to the expose, Bonar said it was irrelevant that some of his clients were professional athletes.

"If they have proven deficiencies on blood work and are symptomatic, I will treat them," he said. "I do not 'dope' or treat patients for the sole purpose of performance enhancement even though these treatments may enhance performance as a secondary effect." Britain's sports minister John Whittingdale said he was "shocked" by the allegations and has demanded an urgent independent investigation.— AP

MADRID CAN WIN LA LIGA AFTER CLASICO COMEBACK: BALE

BARCELONA: Real Madrid star Gareth Bale believes his side can still win La Liga after coming from behind to inflict Barcelona's first defeat in 40 games with a 2-1 victory in El Clasico.

Madrid still trail Barca by seven points with seven league games to play, but Bale also highlighted the importance of the victory to Madrid's confidence ahead of their return to Champions League action against Wolfsburg in the quarter-finals on Wednesday.

"If we wanted to win the league this was a game we had to win," said the Welshman.

"You never know, football does funny things to teams when you lose and you never know what could happen. All they need is a few bad results, we need a few good ones and we're right back in it.

"The most important thing today was to get the win to build confidence for the rest of the season.

"There's still the Champions League as well, which we're really looking forward to." The win was a huge turnaround for Madrid in Zinedine Zidane's first Clasico in charge after suffering a 4-0 thrashing at home to Barca earlier in the season.

Gerard Pique's towering header early in the second half put Barca in front, but Karim Benzema quickly levelled as Madrid tore the hosts apart on the counter-attack after the break.

And despite going down to 10 men when captain Sergio Ramos was sent off seven minutes from time, Bale crossed for Cristiano Ronaldo to strike the winner moments later to spark belief Madrid can end a difficult season on a high.

Real were embarrassingly thrown out the Copa del Rey in December for fielding an ineligible player, but Bale believes having played a competition less than Barca has allowed them to arrive fresher to the business end of the season.

"Maybe being out of the Copa del Rey helps a little bit, we've had less games. We're feeling strong, confident now, and it's one final push until the end of the season. "Tonight really does put us mentally in a strong position, we can beat anyone on our day and we showed that.

"Barcelona have been saying they're the best team and we beat them in their own back yard tonight.

"We had a game plan, we know we've

got speed on the counter-attack so we used that to our advantage. We know obviously if you attack them they're not the best defensive team in the world."

Zidane also hailed the confidence boost victory gives his side ahead of their trip to Wolfsburg.

"We know what we want to do in the Champions League. Very few teams win here and I am happy for the players and for the fans who can be proud of their players. "For confidence it is very important to win here for the rest of the season and just before playing a Champions League game in Germany."

However, the Frenchman quelled suggestions Madrid were back in the title hunt with Atletico Madrid still separating Barca and Real at the top. "First we have to get past Atletico, we are still third and then we will see. "To win here is a huge reward for the players. They played a huge game." Next up for Barca is a Champions League clash with Atletico on Tuesday and coach Luis Enrique insisted he has already turned the page as Barca look to become the first side to retain the trophy in the Champions League era.

"This game already doesn't exist for me," said Enrique. "There is no pain. We came into the game on the back of many games without losing, but defeats can teach you things and the players know that. "Every title has its difficulties, especially when you are playing against opponents with the same objectives."—AFP

PELLEGRINI MAKES HIS POINT AFTER CITY STROLL

BOURNEMOUTH: Manuel Pellegrini hit back at the critics after Manchester City warmed up for their Champions League quarter-final against Paris Saint Germain with an impressive 4-0 victory at Bournemouth.

Goals by Fernando, Kevin De Bruyne, Sergio Aguero and Aleksandar Kolarov at Dean Court on Saturday tightened City's hold on fourth place in the Premier League and boosted confidence ahead of

Wednesday's first leg in Paris.

A poor run of five losses in seven league matches before the international break, including three successive home defeats to title rivals Leicester and Tottenham and in the derby against Manchester United, caused some to doubt that City manager Pellegrini, due to be replaced by Pep Guardiola next season, could still motivate his players.

City's dominant display on the south-coast was the perfect answer and left them in control of their own destiny in the race to qualify for next season's Champions League.

Even without Joe Hart, Yaya Toure, Vincent Kompany and Raheem Sterling, City were too good for Bournemouth and Pellegrini took the opportunity to make a point to the doubters.

"The best way to prepare for the next game was to focus on this game, return to our style of play, try to recover the normal performance of our important players," Pellegrini said.

"We have had a lot of criticism this season but although we have had so many injuries to important players, it is one of the merits of this squad that we are the team that continues to fight in every competition to the end.

"We are the last English team in the Champions League, we won the League Cup, we were forced to go out of the FA Cup because we had several players injured and we prioritised the Premier League and the Champions League. "Unfortunately for us we lost three games at home, to Leicester, Tottenham and Manchester United.

"Of course if you have your players all fit together you win games more easily and that's the way we started the season, winning the first five games.

"If you play without Kevin (De Bruyne), without Yaya (Toure), without (Vincent) Kompany, of course it's another team. But I am very happy with the response of the squad.

"It has not been a bad season apart from the last three home games. I hope we are going to finish the season the same way we started"

WINNING MENTALITY

Although City trail 12 points behind Leicester, Pellegrini would not even rule out the possibility of winning the Premier League title.

"If you have a winning mentality you must always think you can do it if the math-

ematics allow you to do it," he said.
"Of course if you drop points in the way
we did it in the last few games it is more
difficult. And we don't depend on just what

Pellegrini admitted Belgium midfielder De Bruyne, outstanding at Bournemouth on his return from a two-month absence caused by ankle ligament and knee injuries, had made a welcome return ahead of the PSG clash. "He's a very important player," Pellegrini said. "Before he was injured he was playing well, one of the players who was scoring and it was unlucky for him to have that injury.

"He gives Aguero more space. From watching him in training, I was sure he would play the same way he was playing before his injury.

"We played him for only 55 minutes so we'll see how he recovers." Bournemouth manager Eddie Howe, whose team are effectively safe from relegation even though he refuses to admit it, joined in the praise for City's performance.

"The game became very difficult because they are so good at keeping the ball," he said. "They were better in all areas today and we have to accept that. They are the team we want to become." —AFP

ALL EYES ON LIVERPOOL FOR DORTMUND'S 'KLOPP DERBY'

DORTMUND: Borussia Dortmund coach Thomas Tuchel says his team's confidence is sky-high for Thursday's Europa League quarter-final, first-leg, at home to Liverpool in what has been dubbed the 'Jurgen Klopp derby'.

The Liverpool manager enjoyed seven stellar years at Signal Iduna Park and can expect a warm welcomed in Dortmund, ahead of the return leg at Anfield on April

Klopp steered Dortmund to the Bundesliga title in 2011, the league and cup double in 2012 and the 2013 Champions League final, but walked away at the end of last season when they finished seventh in Germany's top flight.

Tuchel, his successor, has given Dortmund fresh impetus and they are second only to Bayern Munich in Germany this season.

Winger Henrikh Mkhitaryan is enjoying a stellar season alongside Germany star Marco Reus and Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang, who has scored 23 league goals, to form a trio which has netted 43 times in the Bundesliga.

But it was super subs Shinji Kagawa and Adrian Ramos who netted late goals in Dortmund's 3-2 fight-back win over Werder Bremen on Saturday as they warmed up for Liverpool.

The win, which secured Dortmund's place in the Champions League next season, was down to their 'diligence and attitude', according to Tuchel, while Klopp dubbed Borussia's gritty team 'monsters of mentality' during his reign.

"To come from behind and stay calm showed a great reaction from the team," said Tuchel.

"It's an extra quality to have someone like Ramos who can come on, but it is a testament to all the players how intensive our training sessions are.

"My players are setting the standard in terms of attitude and diligence.

"Due to the number and type of our victories this season (36 wins in 46 games in all competitions), the team has developed a great confidence. "I didn't get the feeling that the Liverpool game was a factor, but from now on we'll be concerning ourselves with the 'Reds'"

Tuchel had his three first-choice centrebacks missing against Bremen with Neven Subotic injured, Sokratis ill and Mats Hummels rested.

Nevertheless, Aubameyang opened the scoring in the second-half before Kagawa put them level and Ramos headed the late winner after Bremen had gone 2-1 up on 74 minutes thanks to an own goal from Gonzalo Castro and a neat strike from Zlatko Junuzovic.

While Tuchel was not talking about Klopp's return, Dortmund's CEO Hans-Joachim Watzke certainly was and he says his friendship with the Liverpool manager will be put aside until the final whistle.

"We will be clear opponents on Thursday, there is no need for mucking around in a friendship," Watzke told broad-

"My concern is that he will bring the (home) fans to his side and create a atmosphere like you get in a friendly."—AFP

HIGUAIN FROM HERO TO ZERO AS UDINESE DENT NAPOLI HOPES

Serie A goal then saw red as Napoli's hopes of a first title in 26 years were dealt a blow in a bad-tempered 3-1 defeat to Udinese.

Napoli, who last won the title when Diego Maradona played his penultimate season at the club in 1990, were left with a six-point deficit to Juventus after the champions' 1-0 win over Empoli on Saturday. Trailing 2-1 at half-time thanks to a Bruno Fernandes double which included a spot-kick and a spectacular overhead kick, Napoli failed to recover after falling behind to Cyril Thereau's strike just before the hour. Having seen coach Maurizio Sarri sent from the touchlines before the interval for protesting a second penalty award, Napoli suffered another blow when Higuain was given his marching orders in the final quarter

MILAN: Gonzalo Higuain hit his 30th hour. After an angry exchange with the match referee, the Argentine striker had to be restrained by teammates as he tried to remonstrate with Udinese players. If Napoli fail in their title bid on the final matchday on May 15, this loss will be seen as the turning point.

Napoli's first reverse since a 1-0 defeat to Juventus two months ago leaves them second at six points behind four-time consecutive champions Juventus with seven games remaining.

Roma are away at Lazio in the capital derby later looking to close their sevenpoint gap to second place although defeat for Luciano Spalletti's visitors would brighten the Champions League qualifying hopes of both Fiorentina and Inter Milan, who are five points further behind. But Sarri was defiant: "We can't take anything away from Udinese, they

played great while we just never got to play at our usual level. "The defeat will make us angry for a day or so, but it will also give us enough fuel for the next seven games. "We're having a great campaign. We have to pick ourselves up as soon as as possible." Juve's win on Saturday prompted coach Massimiano Allegri to proclaim: "I hope Napoli drop points."

Adding to the pressure, Napoli were without injured 'keeper Pepe Reina (calf) for a fixture they had not won at the Friuli since September 2007. Udinese, despite their poor recent form, had Reina's replacement, Gabriel, flapping in the Napoli net soon after kick-off-prior to which a minute's applause was held and AC Milan legend Cesare Maldini, who died at the age of 84. But coach Gigi De Canio affirmed: "We didn't turn up here just to make up the numbers. It was a great performance against a top side, and one that should give us the belief that we can do it again."

Senegal defender Kalidou Koulibaly was clumsy with his shoulder charge on Emmanuel Badu and after the referee pointed to the spot Fernandes stepped up to squirm a tame shot under the body of Gabriel. Napoli were back on level terms soon after, Higuain hitting a crisp first-timer past Orestis Karnezis on 24 minutes after Jose Callejon's drive was charged down.

But less than a minute later, Udinese earned another penalty when Silvan Widmer was tripped from behind by Faouzi Ghoulam. This time, Gabriel blocked Fernandes's poorly-hit shot but the save did not calm the nerves of Sarri, whose protestations on the touchlines

prompted his expulsion. Udinese remained a threat, Gabriel rushing out to punch at the feet of former Napoli striker Duvan Zapata after Badu's overhead kick had sent the ball towards goal. Zapata flashed a header wide following cross from Thereau soon after while at the other end Higuain fired over and Lorenzo Insigne skewed just wide of the near post. Napoli were stunned on the stroke of half-time when a Gabriel's poor control gave possession to Zapata, who twisted and turned before sending a cross over for Fernandes to fire an overhead kick into the empty net. Gabriel was left stranded again although Napoli's defence was primarily at fault 13 minutes after the restart when Thereau got between Raul Albiol and Elseid Hysaj a yard from goal to guide a cross from the right past the 'keeper. — AFP

JUVE SIGHT RECORD AS ROMA ROUT LAZIO

MILAN: A record-equalling fifth consecutive crown moved a step closer for Serie A champions Juventus yesterday as Roma maintained their Champions League push

with a 4-1 humiliation of derby rivals Lazio. Juventus looked to be down and out of the title race only months after securing a league and Cup double last year in Massimiliano Allegri's first season in charge.

But from a dismal start to the campaign that left the Turin giants only a handful of points above the relegation zone, Juve have pulled six points clear of rivals Napoli following their shock 3-1 defeat at Udinese.

Juve, who last won a fifth straight crown in 1935, managed only a 1-0 win from a dominant performance at home to Empoli on Saturday but it was enough for Allegri to proclaim "I hope Napoli drop points" at Udinese. The 48-year-old's wish came true.

Although Argentine striker Gonzalo Higuain hit his 30th league goal of the campaign, Napoli imploded in a bad-tempered display at the Stadio Friuli that saw coach Maurizio Sarri sent off for dissent and Higuain see red after an angry altercation in the closing quarter hour.

Napoli's dream of securing a first scudetto since Diego Maradona played his penultimate season with the club in 1990 looks to be slipping away, especially as Juve have an arquably easier run-in.

But Sarri says it's not over yet: "The defeat will make us angry for a day or so, but it will also give us enough fuel for the next seven games.

"No one can point the finger at us because we're six points behind Juventus. We're having a great campaign and I have a squad of 25 players who will pick themselves back up and show great determination to finish the season on a high."

Although still in the title race, Napoli will now feel the heat from third-placed Roma, who humiliated Lazio 4-1 in what may have been Francesco Totti's final derby appear-

DEADLOCK

Although Totti is hoping for a 24th and

final year's contract, club president James Pallotta is trying to steer the 39-year-old into a director's role instead.

Having made only six appearances amid an injury-hit season, Totti started on the bench as Roma maintained their push for a third consecutive runners-up spot-albeit in a virtually empty stadium as fans largely heeded boycott calls in protest at new security measures.

Coach Luciano Spalletti told Premium Sport: "I'm sorry Totti didn't have a chance to come on but as coach I have decisions to make and I have other players who are just as strong as him."

The visitors broke the deadlock on 16 minutes when Stephan El Shaarawy got his head to a cross to claim his maiden goal in the 'Derby della Capitale'.

Lazio's few positive notes came from highly-rated Brazilian forward Felipe Anderson in an otherwise disappointing first half. "We suffered in the opening half because it was just too difficult to take possession from them," said coach Stefano Pioli. "On their goals, we made big mistakes but I don't think the score is a true reflection of the game. "In such a difficult season we wanted to give some joy to the fans. All we can do now is give everything we have till the end of the season."

Roma resumed in similar fashion and minutes after replacing El Shaarawy on the hour, Edin Dzeko fired home the rebound from Diego Perotti's drive when it came off the post. German veteran Miroslav Klose, who had replaced Alessandro Matri on 56 minutes, changed Lazio's prospects by rising to head the ball into the path of Marco Parolo for his easy poke into the net on 75 minutes. But Roma finished in style, Alessandro Florenzi pouncing on Gil Patric's poor headed clearance to fire a first-timer past Marchetti, who was left clutching at thin air minutes later when Perotti curled inside his far post.

A win for Inter Milan over Torino will see Roberto Mancini's men move past Fiorentina into fourth place to sit five points behind Roma. — AFP

MORGAN SENDS LEICESTER SEVEN POINTS CLEAR



LEICESTER: Leicester City captain Wes Morgan scored his first goal in almost a year as the Premier League fairytale-title chasers edged Southampton 1-0 yesterday to establish a potentially decisive seven-point lead.

Tottenham Hotspur's 1-1 draw at Liverpool on Saturday had given Claudio Ranieri's men an opportunity to strengthen their grip on first place and they duly took it courtesy of Morgan's 38th-minute header. It was Leicester's fifth 1-0 victory in six matches and with just six games of the season remaining, the 132-year-old club's first ever top-flight title is now tantalisingly with-

The east Midlands side were bottom of the table a year ago, but require just 12 points from a possible 18 to complete one of the most sensational underdog triumphs in world football history. Ronald Koeman's Southampton, who had two penalty appeals for handball turned

away, remain seventh and face an uphill battle to force their way into the Europa League berths.

With chairman Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha laying on free doughnuts and bottles of beer for home fans to mark his birthday and 'Leicester City Champions 2016' scarves for sale on the walk to the ground, the atmosphere could barely have been more festive at a sun-soaked King Power Stadium. In a bid to counter Leicester's two-pronged strike-force of Jamie Vardy and Shinji Okazaki, Southampton deployed a back three and while the home side made the early running, the clearest opportunities of the first half fell to the visitors.

Their best chance saw Graziano Pelle free Sadio Mane, who rounded Kasper Schmeichel and shot, only for the ball to strike Danny Simpson's right forearm as he came across to cover the vacant goal.

Southampton appealed for a penalty, but the right-back's arm had remained close to his body so referee Michael Oliver waved play on.

AUSTIN APPEAL

Pelle also headed over from a Cedric Soares cross, while Jose Fonte fully extended Schmeichel with a rising drive from 25 yards and Jordie Clasie shot narrowly over after outmuscling Riyad Mahrez.

But with Southampton poised to poop the

party, Leicester struck, Christian Fuchs guiding a cross into the box from the left flank and Morgan outjumping Clasie to plant a captain's header inside the left-hand post. Dusan Tadic replaced Matt Targett at half-time for Southampton, who changed to a 4-2-3-1 system, but they were almost undone within seconds of the restart, with Victor Wanyama booked for putting an arm in Vardy's face as the England striker looked to burst clear.

Seconds after coming on Austin had a strong penalty appeal when his shot struck Robert Huth's outstretched left hand, but to the frustration of Southampton-and Tottenham, Arsenal and Manchester City-Oliver was again unmoved.

TRIBUTE TO CRUYFF

THE HAGUE: Hundreds of Dutch football fans yesterday paid further tribute to legendary late player Johan Cruyff, marching between two Amsterdam stadiums ahead of a match by his old team Ajax. "Johan rest in peace," proclaimed a large black banner bearing a picture of the Amsterdam boy, who rose to become one of football's greatest players, carried at the front of the procession.

The large crowd estimated at around 1,500 people sang songs in praise of their hero as they walked from De Meer Stadion, the former home of Ajax, to the bigger 53,00capacity stadium ArenA in the Dutch city. Many of them were wearing the number 14 shirt which was Cruyff's tag during his years

Cruyff, 68, died on March 24 after a brief struggle with cancer, triggering a global outpouring of mourning for a man recognised as

having left a huge footballing legacy. "It is wonderful that so many people have joined in, it's very special," said Sjaak Swart, a former Ajax forward who played a record 600 games with the club.

Cruyff "deserves it more than anyone else. It is awful that he has died from this terrible disease. We should make it a day to remember," Swart added. The march came before a game between Ajax and FC Zwolle later Sunday, when there was also to be a minute's silence before kick-off. About 150 former players from the Amsterdam club were also to attend the game, the Dutch news agency

Outside Cruyff's former home in the Amsterdam district of Betondorp, fans also set off red fireworks. Having led Ajax to the European Cup three times in 1971, 1972 and 1973, Cruyff also led the Netherlands to the 1974 World Cup final where despite losing 2-1 the Dutch won admirers the world over. About 90,000 Barcelona fans on Saturday also took part in a spectacular pre-match display to honour Cruyff-a former player and coach with the Spanish team.—AFP

GLADBACH ROUT HERTHA TO CLIMB INTO CHAMPIONS LEAGUE BERTHS

BERLIN: Borussia Moenchengladbach climbed into the Bundesliga's Champions League places yesterday with a 5-0 hammering of Hertha Berlin as Andre Hahn scored his first goal since his horror injury. Marlon Samuels anchored the West Indies' run chase of 156 with an unbeaten 85, including nine boundaries and two sixes, after England had posted 155-9 in their 20 overs.

After being reduced to 11 for three, Samuels singlehandedly kept the Caribbean team in the hunt with his 66ball blitz. Brathwaite finished on 34 not out off just 10 balls as the 2012 champions completed a hat-trick of titles after the women's clinched their maiden trophy earlier on

The Under-19 team had already lifted the youth World Cup in February. "Everybody in the West Indies is a champion," beamed Sammy.

The Windies also became the first team to lift the World T20 twice. England's batting hero Joe Root had hit Windies hard with a double strike when he shared the new ball with David Willey to get the West Indies' openers trudging back to the dug out.

MARTIAL THE MATCH-WINNER AS UNITED HONOUR CHARLTON



MANCHESTER: Anthony Martial scored the only goal of the game as Manchester United beat Everton 1-0 in the Premier League at Old Trafford yesterday to climb within a point of fourth-placed local rivals Manchester City.

Martial's 54th-minute strike gave the French striker his 13th goal of the season and helped United celebrate the fact that Old Trafford's south stand had been renamed in honour of club great Bobby Charlton in fine fashion. Victory kept alive United boss Louis van Gaal's hopes of qualifying for the Champions League-the top four clubs in England get a spot-and thus satisfying the minimum demand on an Old Trafford manager. This was United's fourth successive home win, a feat they managed for the first time since a six-match streak in April last year. United have now won four of their last five league games, including the Manchester derby at the Etihad Stadium.

Everton, as befits a side with a better away record than at Goodison Park, began with clear attacking intent and the United defence had to be on its toes to deal with Ross Barkley and Romelu Lukaku.

Barkley was a lively influence and in the 12th minute he found Gerard Deulofeu on the right, the Belgian cutting into the penalty area past two tackles without being able to have a clear shot before Matteo Darmian cleared the danger.

Everton continued to delight their travelling contingent with their attacking style, and Leighton Baines saw one of his trademark free kicks diverted for a corner as the first half approached the halfway mark. Lukaku finally had a glimpse of a chance when England centrehalf Chris Smalling slipped but United goalkeeper David de Gea had anticipated the danger and won the race to hack clear.

Daley Blind once more won a one-on-one duel with Lukaku as the Belgian threatened to break away, while at the other end right back Seamus Coleman had to be precision-perfect with a challenge to deny the raiding Marcos Rojo n Everton's penalty area.

United's measured build-up does not always please their fans, but a patient passing move almost resulted in the breakthrough only for defender John Stones to halt Martial in the area.

DELIGHTFUL PASSING

Everton resumed after half-time in determined mood, and Blind did well to block Lukaku's effort in the area when Baines threaded a pass through to the Belgian with his back to goal.

However, it was Martial who broke the deadlock when he got on the end of a delightful passing move that started with Juan Mata, was enhanced by a neat backheel by Marcus Rashford and completed by the striker, who converted at the far post when Coleman failed to connect with an attempted clearance. It was Manchester United's 1,000th home goal in the Premier League. — FP

ROSBERG ROMPS TO FIFTH WIN IN A ROW

SAKHIR, Bahrain: Mercedes driver Nico Rosberg became the eighth man in Formula One history to win five consecutive races with a victory at the Bahrain Grand Prix yesterday, and will now aim to do what all the other seven did: Go on to capture the championship title. Rosberg made it back-to-back wins to start the new season, and five in a row dating to 2015, with a comfortable victory, capitalizing on a first-corner collision involving teammate Lewis Hamilton and an engine failure that prevented Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel from starting the race.

He led throughout to win by 10.2 seconds at the Sakhir circuit over Ferrari's Kimi Raikkonen, with Hamilton recovering from the collision with the Williams of Valtteri Bottas and finishing third. "It was a really good getaway on the dirty side of the grid and that really made my race in the end," Rosberg said. "From then on the car was feeling great and just controlling the pace and playing it safe. "Two wins in a row now, good points, that's where my focus is. Five wins, three wins in a row, doesn't make a difference."

Red Bull's Daniel Ricciardo was fourth and Romain Grosjean fifth in another encouraging performance by the new American-based Haas team. Toro Rosso teenager Max Verstappen was sixth and Red Bull's Daniil Kvyat seventh, ahead of the Williams drivers Felipe Massa and Bottas, with McLaren's Stoffel Vandoorne in 10th to take a point on his F1 debut.

There was drama on the warm-up lap as smoke began pouring from the back of Vettel's Ferrari and he immediately parked the car. It was the second reliability failure for Ferrari already this season after trouble struck Raikkonen in Australia. Pole-sitter Hamilton

again got off to a poor start, like he did in Melbourne, as he adjusts to the new rule restricting drivers to a single clutch at the start. "Two separate incidents, but both equally as painful, perhaps this one today more painful," Hamilton said. "It was just not a good getaway by myself and nothing technical."

The Briton was running behind Rosberg at the first corner when Bottas made an ambitious move on the inside, braked too late and collided with the right side of the Mercedes, dropping Hamilton down to seventh at the end of the first lap. Bottas was blamed by stewards and was forced to do a pit lane drive-through penalty. "Everyone seemed to go very tight inside and it was too late," Bottas said. "I was trying to brake as hard as I could. I got a penalty and I'm sure he lost some places because of that. It's a shame."

With his chief rivals out of the equation, Rosberg sailed away up front, and pushed his lead to 8.5 seconds after six laps and more than 14 by the first round of pit stops for the top cars, beginning on lap 12. The top three matched tire strategy except for Hamilton being put onto the hardest-available medium compound for his middle stint while Rosberg and Raikkonen were on softs. Despite that, Hamilton made his second stop before the pair in front of him.

Raikkonen has finished on the podium in Bahrain eight times without winning, and acknowledged that Ferrari must get on top of its engine troubles if it's to pose a threat to Mercedes this season. "I had a bad start and after a few laps we were one straight behind Nico and it's hard to recover from that," Raikkonen said. "We have some work to be done. It costs a lot of points for the drivers as well as the team."

Hamilton carried damage on the right side of the chassis throughout the race after the first-corner collision. "I had so much damage on the car I could not keep up with Kimi," Hamilton said. BRITAIN MOVES TO BOLSTER FALTERING STEEL INDUSTRY

'TATA WILL ISSUE AN OFFER DOCUMENT VERY SOON

LONDON: The government will do all it can to keep Britain's biggest steelworks running, Business Secretary Sajid Javid said yesterday, in the face of a crisis threatening the country's steel industry. Indian steel giant Tata Steel announced Tuesday it was putting its lossmaking British business up for sale, including the Port Talbot plant on the south Wales coast.

Javid said he thought there was time to find a buyer for the plant and Tata Steel's other

UK assets. "Tata will issue an offer document very soon," he told BBC television. The government is "also going to have to offer support to clinch that buyer and give that steel plant a long-term, viable future". Tata Steel employs around 15,000 staff in Britain.

However, Port Talbot is reportedly losing £1 million (1.3 million Euros, \$1.4 million) a day in the face of high energy costs and plunging prices caused by a chronic global oversupply

of steel and a glut of cheap imports, particularly from China.

Nationalization not the answer The facility is Wales's biggest single employer. "It wouldn't be prudent to rule anything out at this stage, but I think that nationalization is rarely an answer in these situa-

tions," said Javid. "I do feel, though... that there will be enough time to find the right buyer working with the government and being able to take this forward. "We will look at everything we can do to allow a sale going ahead."

Metal processing company Liberty House is looking at some of Tata's British assets. The group's president Sanjeev Gupta was quoted by The Sunday Telegraph newspaper as saying he was not interested in all of Tata's British assets but was prepared to enter negotiations.

"We would need a proper partnership with the government. I don't know what that would entail at this stage," he said, adding that he was heading to Britain today.

"We are in the process of starting a discussion with Tata. "If the company, its people, its workers and the government would be willing to consider my suggestions, then I'm willing to engage in a discussion about what role we will play in that." — AFP

GULF MARKETS RETREAT AS OIL TUMBLES AGAIN

KUWAIT: Gulf stock markets retreated yesterday after Brent crude oil pulled back below \$39 a barrel, while Egypt's bourse erased early gains. Brent fell 3 percent last week, although it finished the first quarter up 6 percent. In response, Riyadh's stock index fell 1.6 percent to a five-week low of 6,126 points, breaking technical support at its mid-March low of 6,202 points.

Yesterday, the Saudi market started trading at 10 am local time (0700 GMT), an hour earlier than previously, and closed at 4 pm local time, half an hour earlier, as part of efforts to develop the market and link trading with other regional bourses.

The petrochemical sector fell 2.2 percent. With first-quarter financial results due in a few weeks, analysts anticipate a further profit squeeze in the sector after the government, to save money, cut gas feedstock subsidies at the end of last year. Riyadh-based NCB Capital expects the sector's net income for 2016 to fall 9.7 percent to 20.0 billion riyals (\$5.33 billion).

There is also uncertainty over economic policy. Deputy crown prince Mohammed bin Salman told Bloomberg at the weekend that the Public Investment Fund would eventually control more than \$2 trillion, partly by taking over shares in national oil giant Saudi Aramco, gaining more financial clout to make further investments and earnings for the government.

There is unease over how this process would be managed and the effect on the stock market. "It seems that retail investors want to sit on some cash for the time being until there is more clarity regarding the National Transformation Plan," said a Jeddahbased analyst. The insurance sector, favored by speculative day traders, tumbled 3.9 percent. But Saudi Arabian Mining (Ma'aden) added 3.5 percent after it said commercial output had begun at the Ad Duwayhi gold

mine in western Saudi Arabia. The impact would begin to appear in second-quarter financial results.

National Shipping Company (Bahri) added 1.9 percent after the oil transporter said it had signed a murabaha, or Islamic finance, facility with Riyad Bank worth 1.425 billion Riyals (\$380 million) to finance construction of five very large crude carriers.

Dubai, Egypt down

Dubai's index fell 1.6 percent in modest volume to 3,303 points, retreating from technical resistance on the March peaks of 3,397-3,421 points. Shares that have recently witnessed a rally of more than 10 percent from their mid-January lows were sold off, with Arabtec and developer Dubai Parks and Resorts dropping 1.8 percent and 2.3 percent respectively.

Energy-related stocks were the main drag on Abu Dhabi's index, which slid 0.7 percent. Abu Dhabi National Energy Co (TAQA) dropped 6.1 percent, erasing most of a 6.5 percent gain which it posted on Thursday after reporting a narrower fourth-quarter loss of 1.22 billion Dirhams (\$332.2 million) versus a net loss of 3.63 billion Dirhams a year ago. Qatar's benchmark fell 1.2 percent in the lowest volume since Jan. 12 as most blue chips were sold. Barwa Real Estate and Vodafone Qatar each dropped more than 1.5

Cairo's main index failed to hold onto early session gains and fell 0.1 percent in the lowest volumes since the devaluation of the Egyptian pound on March 14. Real estate investment firm Amer Group declined 2.3 percent. But investment firm Qalaa Holdings, the most heavily traded stock on the bourse, rose 3.7 percent; it had jumped 8.5 percent in record volume on Thursday. The shares are up 29.7 percent since the devaluation of the pound. — Reuters

GOLD PRICES PLUMMET TO LOWEST LEVEL IN 5 WEEKS

KUWAIT: Gold price dropped to USD 1,207 per ounce, the lowest level since five weeks ago, affected by US employment reports for March, said Sabaek Al-Kuwait Company yesterday. The American reports contributed to boosting the US dollar against major European currencies and precious metals, where the gold lost USD 30 of its price, dropping from the highest level it reached last

The gold dropped from 1,246 per ounce to USD 1,207. However, it remained the safe haven for investors and despite pressure, it settled on Friday at USD 1,223, thus ending the US dollar rebound, buoyed by the American reports and bearish European currencies, may stem the Gold bullish trend in the coming days. But the report forecast showed that it would go up to USD 1,280 per ounce later this month.

Nevertheless, Sabaek speculated that it might cross the USD 1,200 level and reach USD 1,185, due to the bullish greenback, particularly in case the American central bank raised the interest. As to silver, the report said its price reached USD 14.80 per ounce adding that it averaged USD 15.08 in

IRAN OIL EXPORTS SURPASS 2 MILLION BARRELS PER DAY

TEHRAN: Iran's oil exports have surpassed 2 million barrels per day following the lifting of sanctions under its nuclear deal with world powers, Oil Minister Bijan Zanganeh said yesterday. "Iran's oil and gas condensate exports are now at more than 2 million barrels per day" after rising by 250,000 bpd since March 1, the ministry's Shana news service quoted Zanganeh as saying.

Iran has doubled exports since its nuclear accord took effect on January 16. Iran, an OPEC member, has the world's fourthlargest oil reserves but its exports were long hampered by sanctions over its nuclear program. It has moved ahead with an increase in exports despite global concerns over a supply glut that has pushed oil prices to below \$40 a barrel, from more than \$100 a barrel in mid-2014.

Top exporter Saudi Arabia has said it is willing to consider an output freeze to help shore up prices. But in an interview published Friday, Saudi deputy crown prince Mohammed bin Salman reiterated Riyadh's position that other major producers, including Iran, would need to do the same. His remarks drove down oil prices, with US benchmark West Texas Intermediate for delivery in May sliding \$1.55 (4.0 percent) to \$36.79 a barrel on the New York Mercantile Exchange. — AFP

MEGA INDIA COAL PROJECT AWARDED MINING LEASES

SYDNEY: A controversial India-backed giant coal project near Australia's Great Barrier Reef was yesterday awarded mining leases, but developer Adani said it would not commit to a final investment decision until legal challenges against it were

The Queensland state government said the Aus\$21.7 billion (US\$16.7 billion) project to build one of the world's biggest mines was awarded three leases. "This is a major step forward for this project after extensive government and community scrutiny," Queensland Premier Annastascia Palaszczuk said in a statement. "Stringent conditions will continue to protect the environment, landholders' and traditional owners' interests, and our iconic Great Barrier

Reef." The state government added that the mining leases at Carmichael in the Galilee Basin were estimated to contain 11 billion tons of coal. Adani welcomed the announcement, saying the leases gave the Indian conglomerate certainty and the firm had the "clear aim of commencing construction in calendar year 2017" pending the finalization of some second-tier approvals. But the company slammed legal challenges by conservationists, which along with the need for state and federal consent, has seen the approvals process stretched to some six years.

"(The) conclusion of second tier approvals and resolution of politically-motivated legal challenges is the company's principal focus, prior to a final investment decision being made," an Adani spokesman said in a statement. "Having previously sought to progress to the construction phase in 2015, Adani is keenly aware of the risks of proceeding on major works in advance of the conclusion of these mat-

The awarding of the leases came two months after state authorities gave the project environmental approval subject to some 140 conditions. Conservationists have argued the mega-mine would threaten the heritage-listed Great Barrier Reef, the world's biggest coral reef ecosystem. Adani faces two legal challenges-one from an indigenous group and another mounted by an environmental organization. The organization, the Australian Conservation Foundation, slammed the decision and said its case in the Federal Court would be heard next month. "By granting a license for this massive coal mine the Palaszczuk government is bowing to the demands of big polluters, not listening to the needs of the people," the foundation's chief executive Kelly O'Shanassy said in a statement.

'Reef threatened'

Researchers say the reef is currently experiencing the worst bleaching on record in its pristine north, with few corals escapng damage. The biodiversity site is also threatened by climate change, which conservationists said causes the bleaching, as well as farming run-off, development and the coral-eating crown-of-thorns starfish. A

research paper published Saturday warned authorities' efforts to reduce the discharge of land-based pollutants into the reef were "unlikely to be sufficient to protect the GBR ecosystems from declining water quality within the aspired time frames".

Canberra in March last year unveiled the "Reef 2050" plan to save the major tourist attraction ahead of a United Nations decision in July that kept the reef off its endangered list. The government was required to report back to the UN on its progress in implementing the plan by December 1 this year. But the new paper's co-author, principal research scientist Frederieke Kroon of the government's Australian Institute of Marine Science, said water quality targets might be missed. — AFP

TOKYO: The operator of Japan's destroyed Fukushima nuclear plant switched on a giant refrigeration system on Thursday to create an unprecedented underground ice wall around its damaged reactors. Radioactive water has been flowing from the reactors, and other methods have failed to fully control it. The cooling water becomes radioactive and leaks out through damaged areas into the building basements, where it mixes with groundwater, increasing the volume of contaminated water. Nearly 800,000 tons of radioactive water have been pumped out, treated and stored in 1,000 tanks that now occupy virtually every corner of the Fukushima plant, interfering with its decontamination and decommissioning and adding to the risk of further leaks of water into the nearby ocean.

Q. Are there risks?

A. Construction officials say the coolant is environmentally safe. There were doubts that the huge refrigeration system could effectively freeze the soil while groundwater continues to flow in the area. The operator, Tokyo Electric Power Co, says results from a test of part of the wall last summer were mixed but suggest the system has sufficient capability. Experts are also concerned that an ice wall cannot be adjusted quickly in an emergency situation, such as a sudden increase in the flow of contaminated water, because it takes several weeks to freeze or melt. Electrical costs for running the refrigeration system could be steep. TEPCO says the wall, once formed, can remain frozen for up to two months in the event of a power failure.

Q. Who made the ice wall?

A. The 35 billion yen (\$312 million) project was funded by the government and built by Kajima Corp., which has used similar technology in smaller projects such as subway construction. The wall was delayed by technical uncertainties and was finished last month, a year behind schedule. — AP

DEATH BY OVERWORK RISES AMONG JAPAN'S WORKERS

TOKYO: Japan is witnessing a record number of compensation claims related to death from overwork, or "karoshi", a phenomenon previously associated with the long-suffering "salary man" that is increasingly afflicting young and female employees.

Labor demand, with 1.28 jobs per applicant, is the highest since 1991, which should help Prime Minister Shinzo Abe draw more people into the workforce to counter the effect of a shrinking population, but lax enforcement of labor laws means some businesses are simply squeezing more out of employees, sometimes with tragic consequences.

Claims for compensation for karoshi rose to a record high of 1,456 in the year to end-March 2015, according to labor ministry data, with cases concentrated in healthcare, social services, shipping and construction, which are all facing chronic worker shortages. Hiroshi Kawahito, secretary general of the National Defense Counsel for Victims of karoshi, said the real number was probably 10 times higher, as the government is reluctant to recognize such incidents.

"The government hosts a lot of symposiums and makes posters about the problem, but this is propaganda," he said. "The real problem is reducing working hours, and the government is not doing enough." The labor ministry did not respond to requests for comment. Kawahito, a lawyer who has been dealing with karoshi since the 1980s, said 95 percent of his cases used to be middle-aged men in white-collar jobs, but now about 20 percent are women.

Japan has no legal limits on working hours, but the labor ministry recognizes two types of karoshi: death from cardiovascular illness linked to overwork, and suicide following work-related mental stress. A cardiovascular death is likely to be considered karoshi if an employee worked 100 hours of overtime in the month beforehand, or 80 hours of overtime in two or more consecutive months in the previous six.

A suicide could qualify if it follows an individ-

ual's working 160 hours or more of overtime in one month or more than 100 hours of overtime for three consecutive months. Work-related suicides are up 45 percent in the past four years among those 29 and younger, and up 39 percent among women, labor ministry data show.

Two-tier workforce

The problem has become more acute as Japan's workforce has divided into two distinct categories - regular employees, and those on temporary or non-standard contracts, frequently women and younger people.

In 2015 non-regular employees made up 38 percent of the workforce, up from 20 percent in 1990, and 68 percent of them were women. Lawyers and academic say unscrupulous employers operate a "bait-and-switch" policy, advertising a full-time position with reasonable working hours, but later offering the successful applicant a non-regular contract with longer hours, sometimes overnight or weekends, with

Refusing overtime pay and break time are illegal, and the applicant could refuse the job, but activists say companies tell them they will be given regular contracts after six months or so. They say young applicants often accept due to lack of experience, while women trying to reenter the workforce after childbirth often feel it would be difficult to get a foothold elsewhere.

Emiko Teranishi, head of the Families Dealing with Karoshi support group, said she hears lots of complaints about hiring tactics, with some companies telling new hires that their salary includes 80 hours of overtime, and they must reimburse the company if they work less. "Some people don't even make minimum wage under this system," said Teranishi, whose own husband committed suicide after working long hours. Such abuses have become so common in the past 10 years that such companies have been dubbed "black" companies in the

PARCHED FIELDS FORCE THAILAND TO LOOK BEYOND RICE

NONTHABURI: Thailand has long served as one of the globe's main rice bowls, but chronic water shortages are pushing the country to move away from a grain that dominates its fields and has defined a way of life for generations. Laddawan Kamsong has spent the past forty years coaxing rice from her plot in central Thailand, but she is tired of watching her farmland squeezed dry by increasingly severe droughts.

"I plan to replace some rice paddies with limes," she said after attending a government-run workshop urging farmers to diversify their crops. Thailand is one of the world's top rice exporters. But four consecutive years of below-average rainfall have drained water reserves and strangled production, pushing many farmers into debt.

The current drought, the worst the country has seen in decades, has hit nearly a third of Thailand's 76 provinces, particularly in the rice-heavy central and northeast. Reservoirs are also dropping to historically low levels. The kingdom's military government is now organizing training sessions to encourage millions of rice farmers to diversify into crops

that require less irrigation.

Unlike nearly all other crops, rice grows best in a flooded field, with the stalk's base

completely submerged for most of the growing season. At an army-run workshop held in patch of shade in a field in Nonthaburi province near Bangkok, Laddawan was sold the merits of cultivating fruit trees.

In other regions, they are suggesting sugarcane or peas. These alternatives will drastically reduce water consumption but also break the monoculture that has deteriorated Thai soil for decades. "We have no choice, we need to adapt," Laddawan said, explaining that she used to plant three rice crops annually, but next year will only have enough

Rivers run dry

As the drought bites, some 2,000 Thai villages are surviving off water delivered by the government, while 'rainmaking' airplanes are flying over parched plains, sending an iodine solution into the air in an effort to seed

After last year's especially weak rainy season-which falls between June and Octoberthe ruling military junta asked farmers to abandon their winter rice crop, which is normally cultivated through irrigation and not rainfall. "The amount of water in storage is low and now we expect that this year's rainy

season will be delayed because of El Nino," said Suphot Tovichakchaikul, who leads the country's water management department.

The El Nino weather phenomenon tends to weaken the annual monsoon, which is a lifeline to farmers across the region. According to a study from the University of the Chamber of Commerce, the drought could shave between 0.5 and 0.8 percent off Thailand's GDP growth, with its annual rice production predicted to drop almost 30 percent to 25 million tonnes.

Thailand is also facing increasing competition from Vietnam and India, who have been jockeying for the top exporter spot and at times surpassed Thailand's output in recent years. The junta says Thai rice is no longer sustainable on its current scale. "We must find a way to motivate rice producers to switch to other crops," Junta chief Prayut Chan-o-Cha said in a recent speech. His military government, which grabbed power in a 2014 coup, has struggled to revive Thailand's flat economy, which is beset by falling exports, high household debt and low consumer confidence. — AFP

CHINA FACTORIES SCENT A HINT OF SPRING, EU CHILLS

LONDON/SYDNEY: Activity in China's vast factory sector grew for the first time in nine months during March to bring a hint of spring to the global economy, although growth remained weak in Europe, leading to a muted response in financial markets. A survey due later on Friday is expected to show the United States enjoyed a return to growth after five months of contraction alongside another strong jobs report.

Headlining in Asia was a rise in the official version of the Chinese Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) to 50.2, beating forecasts and above the 50-point mark that separates growth from contraction. The private Caixin/Markit PMI found output, total new orders and output prices all returned to growth, while a survey of the service sector surprised with its strength.

"It does seem to indicate that the manufacturing sector is warming up a bit," said Raymond Yeung, senior economist at ANZ in Hong Kong. "New orders were up 2.8 points, which is a very strong figure." "We think there are basically two factors driving the recovery: the first is a possible acceleration in infrastructure spending. The second is a broader pickup in external demand." However, while euro zone factories rounded off the first quarter in slightly better shape than initially thought the growth in activity remained weak despite the deepest price-cutting since late 2009. The euro zone survey suggested manufacturing is still dragging on the wider economy. It came soon after the European Central Bank unleashed a bold easing package in its latest attempt to spur growth and drive up inflation - which at -0.1 percent in March was nowhere near its 2 percent target goal - but it doesn't seem to be working yet.

Despite the price-cutting and ECB stimulus, Markit's PMI for the euro zone only rose to 51.6 from February's year-low of 51.2, only slightly better than an earlier flash estimate of 51.4. The bloc's economy grew just 1.6 percent in 2015 and the first quarter's PMIs suggest there will be little improvement anytime soon.

"The softening of forward looking components in the past two months is consistent with our scenario of a slower growth in Q2-Q3," said Apolline Menut at Barclays. Looking at the country breakdowns, growth remained weak in Germany and activity contracted in France but Spain, Italy, the Netherlands, Austria and in particular Ireland saw robust expansions. In Britain, outside the currency bloc, manufacturing growth edged up in March from its weakest level in nearly three years, suggesting the sector will contribute little to economic growth in early 2016.

Chinese spring

he relatively upbeat Chinese surveys should give some comfort to Federal Reserve Chair Janet Yellen who this week cited the global risks emanating from there as one reason to be cautious on raising US rates. Yet, China watchers still suspect more support will be needed from Beijing, especially if it wants to avoid a politically unsettling rise in unemployment. Ratings agency Standard & Poor's underlined the need for faster reform when it changed China's credit outlook to negative on Thursday.

The economic pulse across the rest of Asia was more erratic. South Korea's PMI bounced to within a whisker of 50 in March while stronger shipments of smartphones and steel saw exports decline at the slowest pace in four months. Indonesia put an end to 17 straight months of contraction as its PMI popped up to 50.6, with output, new orders and employment all improving. Japan, however, was busy going backwards as the Markit/Nikkei PMI of 49.1 was the lowest since February 2013. That echoed a gloomy survey of manufacturers from the Bank of Japan which found sentiment at its darkest in nearly three years, a result that lopped 3 percent off the Nikkei.

All of which heightened pressure on Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and the central bank to do more to shore up the stuttering economy. "This data confirmed the very cautious stance of Japanese firms reflecting the market volatility since January. There's no signs of corporate sentiment bottoming in coming months," said Mari Iwashita, chief market economist at SMBC Friend Securities. "There's more than a 50 percent chance the BOJ will consider easing policy further this month." — Reuters

MALAYSIAN SEEKS TO FREE VILLAGE 'TRAPPED IN TIME'

Rustic ethnic-Malay enclave remains an anomaly

KAMPUNG BARU: In the shadow of Kuala Lumpur's mammoth Petronas Towers lies an urban anomaly: the rustic ethnic-Malay enclave of Kampung Baru, where chickens and barefoot children dart across streets little changed in a century. Authorities hope to

The last remaining large tract of undeveloped land in the capital's urban core, Kampung Baru is targeted for a historic redevelopment, part of larger plans to upgrade the metropolis of seven million people. But many residents of the languid 120-hectare neighborhood, known for its unique Malay-only land-ownership and proud sense of identity, won't budge.

"Do you want to live in the squalid conditions your grandparents did 50 years ago?" said an exasperated Affendi Zahari, head of a government entity tasked with spurring the redevelopment. He added: "We don't want to see this place trapped in time." British colonizers, mindful of balancing Malaysia's competing ethnicities, set aside Kampung Baru ("New Village") in 1900 for members of the typically rural Muslim ethnic Malay majority to prevent the industrious Chinese minority dominating the then fast-growing city.

It takes a village

Kampung Baru experienced some of the deadly Malay-Chinese ethnic strife the capital faced in 1969 and its residents participated in huge demonstrations for political reform in the late 1990s. But as Chinesefuelled development raised the skyline higher, Kampung Baru remains essentially a country village, the symbolic heart of Kuala Lumpur's Malay identity. Its weathered wooden homes are packed in along narrow, maze-like, rain-puddled lanes clogged with parked cars and shaded by overgrown mango and frangipani trees. On most corners, traditional open-air eateries pile high foods like spicy fried chicken, curries and banana fritters, as grilled fish sizzles over coals and longtime neighbors discuss the news. Hashimah Yun's grandparents scraped together enough money to buy a plot well before Malaysia's independence in 1957. The modest original house gradually expanded into a sprawling, ramshackle home for a dozensstrong extended family that has priceless emotional and cultural value, she said.

"My grandparents opened this land with their blood and money. We won't sell at any price," said Hashimah, a feisty 56-year-old retired bank employee, her head swaddled in a green Muslim headscarf. A government master plan, however, would jerk Kampung Baru, whose land is estimated to be worth over \$1 billion, into the 21st century. The futuristic proposals include glass-and-steel developments fusing hotels, modern apartments, parks, pedestrian walkways, even a man-made lake.

The scheme is part of a larger facelift for Kuala Lumpur, already one of Southeast Asia's more modern capitals, to remain attractive for investors as regional competition increases. Upcoming billion-dollar projects include a new financial district, a city-wide mass transit system, high-speed rail links to Singapore, and a 630-metre skyscraper that would outstretch the Petronas Towers by 180 metres.

Last October, Prime Minister Najib Razak appealed to Kampung Baru's people to embrace change or risk being viewed as "squatters". Malay developers are offering residents around 500 ringgit per square foot for land, sharply lower than prices in nearby areas due to Kampung Baru's lack of modern infrastructure.

Officials say progress has been negligible. With land prices rising rapidly in Malaysia, Hashimah fears her family would struggle to stay together elsewhere. Like others, she called instead for government investment in Kampung Baru's decrepit infrastructure to improve resident's lives, and suggested that intentional neglect was aimed at driving landowners away. They want to "grab our land, chase us out and make money," she said.

'Tough process'

As a cautionary tale, many locals cite a 1980s debacle in which some residents lost their land when a developer's plans went bust. Chan Wai Seen of JS Valuers Research & Consultancy said Kampung Baru's unbeatable location offers tantalizing potential, but unlocking it is a challenge.

Hurdles include the poor infrastructure, rising costs of land and construction, a slowing economy, and the Malay-only ownership, he said. "We need to ask just how competitive Kampung Baru will really be," Chan said. The government is leaving Affendi to try to facilitate private deals rather than wade in directly, wary of angering locals. A trickle of landowners have sold in recent years, but momentum is further constrained by the fact that many of the thousands of parcels are jointly held by several owners, complicating deal-making. "It's a tough process," lamented Affendi, tacitly admitting that Kampung Baru's village-in-the-city atmosphere will survive for the time being. — AFP

GREECE DEMANDS EXPLANATION OVER LEAKED DEBT TRANSCRIPT

ATHENS: Greece demanded an explanation from the International Monetary Fund after an apparent leaked transcript suggested the IMF may threaten to pull out of the country's bailout as a tactic to force European lenders to offer more debt relief.

EU/IMF lenders will resume talks on Greece's fiscal and reform progress in Athens today, aiming to conclude a bailout review that will unlock further loans and pave the way for negotiations on longdesired debt restructuring. The review has been adjourned twice since January due to a rift among the lenders over the estimated size of Greece's fiscal gap by 2018, as well as disagreements with Athens on pension reforms and the management of bad

Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras's office said yesterday that Tsipras had asked IMF Managing Director Christine Lagarde to clarify the Fund's stance, after Internet whistleblowing site WikiLeaks published what it said was the transcript of a March 19 conference call of three senior IMF officials.

The officials were discussing tactics to apply pressure on Greece, Germany and the EU to reach a deal in April. They were quoted as discussing a threat that the fund might not participate in Greece's third bailout program as a way to force EU

creditors, especially Germany, to reach a deal on debt relief before Britain's June referendum on whether to stay in the European Union.

"He (Tsipras) sent a letter to Lagarde last night, asking her to clarify the Fund's official stance in the negotiations," an official at Tsipras' office told Reuters. "He also expressed his concern about the credibility of the negotiations after the leaks." An IMF spokesman in Washington said on Saturday that the Fund was not commenting on "leaks or supposed reports of internal discussions" but added the IMF

had made its position known in public. "We have stated clearly what we think is needed for a durable solution to the economic challenges facing Greece - one that puts Greece on a path of sustainable growth supported by a credible set of reforms matched by debt relief from its European partners," the spokesman said. German government and finance ministry spokespeople declined to comment on the leaked transcript. Germany has in the past said the IMF is an important player in the Greek rescue but it does not support the debt relief demanded by the IMF. Some German officials also say that they believe there are different views on Greece within the IMF. German Chancellor Angela Merkel is due to meet Lagarde in Berlin on Tuesday.

Tsipras says IMF 'playing games'

The purported conversation on the conference call involved Poul Thomsen, head of the IMF's Europe department, Delia Velculescu, leader of the IMF team in Greece, and IMF official Iva Petrova. They discussed whether Greece could apply more austerity as a condition for receiving more aid ahead of big debt repayments in July and voiced frustration at the European Commission's reluctance to side with IMF pressure on Athens. They also suggest that Brussels is sticking to unrealistic assumptions about Greece's budget shortfall to minimize the need for debt relief, which is unpopular with Germany and other northern euro zone hawks. If concluded the review will unlock a fresh tranche of about 5 billion euros (\$5.7 bln), which Greece needs to pay off state arrears and European Central Bank and IMF maturing debt. Greece has no major debt redemptions due until July. The Greek government interpreted the leak as revealing an IMF effort to blackmail Athens with a possible credit event to force it to give in on pension cuts which it has rejected. However the transcript, if genuine, appeared to suggest Thomsen saw more prospect of the IMF applying pressure on Chancellor Merkel to concede debt relief to keep the Fund involved in the bailout and secure Greek cooperation in managing Europe's pressing refugee crisis. — Reuters

HUAWEI REPORTS REVENUE OF \$60.8 BILLION IN 2015

Carrier BG generated CNY 232.3 billion (US\$35.8 billion) in annual revenue, up 21% YoY. Widespread rollout of 4G networks accounted for a large portion of this growth.

The Enterprise BG generated CNY 27.6 billion (US\$4.3 billion) in annual revenue, an increase of 44% YoY. In particular, Huawei's enterprise business experienced rapid growth in the public safety, finance, transportation, and energy sectors.

A major highlight of the company's performance in 2015, Huawei's Consumer BG reported CNY 129.1 billion (US\$19.9 billion) in annual revenue, up 73% YoY. This increase was a direct result of increased demand for high-quality products that deliver a premium user experience, as well as Huawei's growing influence as a consumer brand.

Over the past 20-plus years, Huawei has remained focused on ICT infrastructure, steadily investing in R&D. In 2015 alone, Huawei invested 15% of its annual revenue -CNY 59.6 billion (US\$9.2 billion) - in research and development. WALL STREET OFF TO A SOLID START IN APRIL

NEW YORK: Wall Street extended a sevenweek rally on Friday after upbeat US jobs and factory data hinted at stronger corporate earnings without increasing concerns of potential US interest rate hikes. The Labor Department's report showed solid gains in nonfarm payrolls in March while the unemployment rate rose to 5 percent from an eight-year low of 4.9 percent as more Americans entered the labor force.

Along with another report showing the US manufacturing sector resumed growth in March, the employment data suggested the economy is not growing fast enough to increase concerns about inflation. "It's a very solid number overall, but I don't think it

changes anything as far as the Fed's outlook," said Jon Adams, a senior investment strategist and portfolio manager at BMO in Chicago.

Increasing skepticism

Stock gains were limited by a 1.39 percent drop in the S&P 500 energy sector as oil prices tumbled nearly 4 percent amid increasing skepticism about a deal to freeze crude production. Since mid-February, the S&P has surged 13 percent, recovering from deep losses thanks to a stabilization of oil prices and reduced concerns about a stumble in China's economy and its potential fallout in the United States.

Wall Street has been concerned about tepid

corporate earnings and will keep a close eye on the quarterly reports that start rolling in coming weeks. Analysts expect S&P 500 companies' first-quarter earnings to fall 7 percent year over year, with energy companies weighing heavily, according to Thomson Reuters data.

"We don't think P/E ratios are going anywhere," said Charlie Smith, chief investment officer at Fort Pitt Capital Group, adding that he believes the S&P 500 is fairly valued. "For this year, we think it's going to be a tough slog." The Dow Jones industrial average rose 0.61 percent to end at 17,792.75 points and the S&P 500 gained 0.63 percent to 2,072.78, The Nasdaq Composite added 0.92 percent to 4,914.54.

For the week, the S&P climbed 1.8 percent, the Dow added 1.6 percent and the Nasdaq jumped 3 percent. On Friday, eight of the 10 major S&P sectors were higher. The healthcare sector rose 1.27 percent, boosted by Regeneron. The drugmaker's shares surged 12.43 percent after its experimental treatment for eczema was found highly effective in two large studies.

Chevron lost 1.19 percent and weighed the most on the Dow, while Exxon fell 0.75 percent and was the biggest drag on the S&P. Marriott fell 5.68 percent after China's Anbang Insurance abandoned its competing \$14 billion bid for Starwood Hotels. Starwood lost 4.85

Although the major indexes closed higher, declining issues outnumbered advancing ones on the NYSE by 1,576 to 1,448. On the Nasdag, 1,591 issues rose and 1,193 fell. The S&P 500 index showed 70 new 52-week highs and two new lows, while the Nasdaq recorded 61 new highs and 20 new lows. About 7 billion shares changed hands on US exchanges, above/below the 7.6 billion daily average for the past 20 trading days, according to Thomson Reuters data.

European shares slumps

European equities tumbled to a onemonth low on the first trading day of the quarter on Friday, with energy stocks hit by weaker oil prices while Osram retreat-

ed after it was dropped from Apple's top supplier list. The pan-European FTSEurofirst 300 index was down 1.5 percent at its close, hitting its lowest level in a month earlier in the session. The benchmark index fell 7.7 percent in the first

European stock markets stayed in negative territory after the U.S. jobs data was published. Some traders pointed to the fact that the U.S. unemployment rate rose to 5.0 percent from an eight-year low of 4.9 percent as making it more likely that the United States may refrain from further interest rate rises in the near future.

This pushed down the U.S dollar on currency markets, but moved the euro up against the dollar - impacting European stocks since European exporters often benefit from a weak euro to make their goods more affordable for overseas buyers. "More dollar weakness seems likely for now, which could have a negative effect on European stocks," said Darren Sinden at Admiral Markets.

Energy stocks dropped 2.7 percent as a decline in crude oil prices pushed down the shares of BP and Total. Osram fell after dropping from Apple's list of its top suppliers but shares in steelmaker Thyssenkrupp rose 4.9 percent after German business paper Rheinische Post reported that India's Tata Steel was planning to take a stake in Thyssenkrupp's European steel unit. The FTSEurofirst remains down by around 9 percent since the start of 2016. — Reuters

YELLEN STABS THE US DOLLAR IN THE HEART

NBK WEEKLY MONEY MARKET REPORT

UNITED STATES Fed speakers cautiously optimistic

The market continues to price out Fed tightening and the dot plot has followed through. As the ECB, BoJ and the PBoC remain in a monetary expansionary mode and are likely to continue on the same path in 2016, the divergence in rates between the US and the other G5 countries continues to widen. The existence of external risks despite the induced low volatility environment from central banks, are likely to keep an upward pressure to the US dollar. During a speech this week, Yellen struck a dovish tone mentioning the uncertain inflation environment in the US. With consumer price index moving higher in the US in comparison to the other G5, she is still not convinced about the stickiness of the latest increase in inflation.

Internally, US employment data in Q1 remain robust and housing although volatile remains in an expansionary mode. The main economic drag and concerns in Q1 was on the back of the manufacturing and industrial sector, coming from high levels of inventories build and lower factory orders.

Weak external demand, due to dollar strength and subdued global growth, continue to weigh on the economy and are likely to continue being a drag, even with the service sector doing the major lifting to compensate for the weakness in the manufacturing sector.

Externally, a weaker dollar has helped China avoid extreme market pressure on the currency front, a hard landing and provided more monetary flexibility. A weaker US dollar has also helped the global credit cycle, reduced EM reserve erosion and supported commodity prices in the first quarter of 2016. Having seen the short term benefits of a lower dollar, Yellen provided a firm reminder that the Fed is not going to be tightening further, at the same time attempting to calm market over the possibility that the Fed could move in April and June as some of the previous Fed speaker comments.

Since the beginning of the year, the US dollar index has lost 4.2% and almost 5% since the Fed hiked in December 2015. Historically, the US dollar depreciated by on average 5.6% during the last 3 cycles six months following the first fed hike. The Fed outlook seems to price much bigger global risks than what we have witnessed in the past month. If China were to remain stable, the Fed will have to turn more hawkish again. For now, the Fed is likely to continue to attempt to push out any rate hikes until investors find clarity from Asia and emerging markets. Fundamentals for the US however remain solid, however, a neutral to lower dollar continues to help all global players.

On the foreign exchange side, the Euro gained across the week starting on Monday at 1.1163 to reach a high of 1.1438. The currency ended the

The Sterling Pound remains under pressure and

has been the G10 laggard since the beginning of the year amid mounting Brexit risks. The downward pressure isn't likely to go away for now, and likely to intensify as we get closer to the referendum date in late June. After starting the week near the low of 1.4132, the Pound rallied on the back of a weakening US dollar to close on Friday at 1.4227.

On the commodities side, after a strong five week's performance, commodities seem to reach an exhaustion point for now. Oil markets seem to find a stable phase around the current levels on hopes for an output freeze by major producers. Brent closed the week at \$38.67, while West Texas at \$36.79.

tain' and that recent readings on the US economy are 'somewhat mixed'. She also went as far as to say that the committee has 'considerable scope' to ease policy if necessary and that the Fed has tools at their disposal that can be used to effectively strengthen the recovery from the Great Recession and would be used again if needed. Both China and volatility in Oil prices were also made mention to several times as risks to the US outlook.

Fed speakers adding to the confusion

Charles Evans, president of the Fed reserve bank of Chicago, said that he expected the US economy



Sentiment continue to swing on news that OPEC and non-OPEC producers will hold a meeting in Doha on April 17. On the precious metals front, Gold remains well supported this week's. The latest Janet Yellen's speech has reignited demand for Gold. The solid job report however brought the metal down to close the week at \$1,222.

A dovish Yellen is back

Janet Yellen reiterated the Federal Reserve's cautious outlook this week in a speech at the Economic Club of New York. She highlighted the risks posed to the US by a global economic slowdown. Owing to weaker-than-expected growth overseas and a cloudy domestic inflation outlook, Yellen reiterated a need to "proceed cautiously" in lifting interest

The main focus was on her comment that the committee would proceed cautiously in adjusting policy. Yellen also highlighted that the outlook for US inflation had become 'somewhat more uncerto be strong enough to justify raising rates twice this year. Evans did come across as a little more cautious with regards to his views on inflation saying specifically that he was a 'bit uneasy' on hitting the 2% target. The Fed President also said that 'it is too early to tell whether the recent firmer readings in the inflation data will last or prove to be temporary volatility and reverse in coming months', while also signaling that is important for the Fed to take the recent decline in inflation expectations, as perceived by the market, seriously.

Housing sector volatile but robust

US home prices in 20 major metropolitan areas climbed 5.7% in January compared to a year ago, according to the S&P Case-Shiller report, matching expectations of 5.7%. Prices were up 0.8% in January from December slightly higher than estimates of a 0.7% pace. Housing sector remain robust despite the Federal Reserve's move in December to increase interest rates.

EUROPE & UK The ECB dilemma in 2016

Since the launch of the ECB quantitative easing program in 2015, the Euro has strengthened almost 2%. Today, the Eurozone inflation remains a major concern. Even with monthly purchases of 80 billion Euros, and placing the ECB deposit rates further into negative, the currency remains on the strong and growth on the weak side. The 5 years inflation expectations in Europe have dropped significantly to 1.40% while the ECB target is at 2%.

In addition to the sticky low inflation environment, additional European risks come in 2016. Whether on the political front with the latest terror attacks and the refugee's problems, financial risk in the Eurozone was the main market focus in the first quarter of the year. The ECB tackled the later thanks to the large injection of fresh new money through the announcement of four years new TLTROs. On the data side, Europe economic surprise index remains into negative, which is likely to keep the ECB on the intervention side whether verbally or reducing further rates into the negative.

German retail sales weaker while inflation still low

Retail sales in Germany declined slightly in February. The data came below expectations at 0.4% in February after a drop of 0.1% in January. On an annual basis, the data was much more positive increasing by 5.4% from February 2015. German inflation on the other hand came at 0.8% from the 0.3% in February. Year on year, inflation is also up, rising by 0.3% from February's drop of

Elsewhere in Europe, Spanish Consumer price inflation increased less-than-expected in February. CPI in Spain increased to 0.6% compared to -0.4% recorded in January. Although a sizable increase, it still failed to meet market expectations of 0.7%. French Consumer price inflation was also out increasing a more-than-expected rate in February at 0.7%, from the 0.3% recorded in the previous

UK data are setting for a weaker second half of the year

The upcoming UK referendum on EU membership contributed to the Pound weakness in the first quarter of 2016. Moreover, fears about the current account, Britain's credit rating and the global economic conditions have been drivers of the pound's recent fall. The longer term effects of Brexit are also likely to be adverse. According to economists, growth would suffer as a detailed analysis from the Bank of England last October found that EU membership had benefited the British economy.

In the first quarter of the year, UK growth has slowed and downside risks remain on the back of renewed fiscal tightening. Economic data however have been coming stronger than expected in the past month with inflation moving higher on the back of stronger commodities prices.

The UK's manufacturing PMI came in at 51 compared to expectations of 51.2 in March. The employment sub-index has now been in negative for six of the last eight months. According to the report, the data suggest hiring at small and medium-sized companies failed to offset job shedding at larger manufacturers.

On a different more positive front, the UK house prices increased in March as rental investors rushed to purchase property before a tax increase. The average price of a home rose 0.8% from February. The annual rate of growth surged to 5.7%, the strongest in more than a year. A shortage of homes for sale is being aggravated by landlords trying to buy investment properties before a tax change on second homes takes effect this month. With demand also being boosted by low borrowing costs, the Bank of England has warned that risks in the property market are rising.

ASIA

Chinese government efforts have delivered

People's fears of a sharp Chinese slowdown were the main market attention in the first quarter of the year. Markets in March proved that these worries were overdone and not supported by macro data which continued to point to a very gradual slowdown. This week, Chinese PMI came on the strong side beating market expectations. The data came at 50.2 while economists expected 49.4. The government efforts as well as potential further fiscal easing have generated the short term results that the government was looking for. The problem remain the fact that deceleration continues in the export sectors, and it seems that the investment led growth model has reached its limit.

Abenomics hitting a road block

In the first quarter of 2016, the Yen broke below the 115 level needed to sustain the up-trend we have seen since 2012. The Japanese currency was mainly supported on the back of the weak global risk appetite and a continued risk aversion. Additional gains were also due to the fiscal vearend repatriation of funds. In March, the global positive sentiment helped the currency stabilize around the 113 level; however Yellen's dovishness gave a boost to the currency. On the data front, industrial production came weak, falling 6.2% month-on-month in February, exceeding expectations for a 5.9% drop. We believe that further deterioration in the local economic conditions would pressure the government to intervene verbally and further adopt new easing actions to limit the yen's appreciation in order to defend Abenomics policies ahead of the July election.

NEW AMENITY AT LA HOTELS: A HIGHER MINIMUM WAGE

LOS ANGELES: Nine months into a minimum wage hike at some Los Angeles hotels, city leaders and other backers of the move are claiming victory, saying doomsday forecasts from hoteliers have proven unfounded.

Confined to about 15 of the city's largest non-union hotels and accounting for more than a fifth of all its hotel rooms, the increase was aimed at the segment of the service economy that city leaders saw as best equipped to absorb the extra cost. Hoteliers say full data are not yet in and some layoffs have taken place, but champions of the raise say that the naysayers' concerns appear to have been overblown.

"There have not been the wholesale layoffs or cutbacks that we were told would occur," said Los Angeles City Councilman Curren Price, who co-authored the wage hike ordinance. The pay rise for a small slice of an industry gives an early if limited glimpse into the drive for a \$15 minimum wage, gathering pace in states from New York to the West Coast. The federal minimum

wage has been stuck at \$7.25/hour since 2009. A phased statewide raise to \$15, ultimately affecting 5.6 million workers, was approved by the California legislature last week and Governor Jerry Brown, a Democrat, is expected to sign it into law on Monday.

Pushing wages to just over \$15 from as low as \$9 an hour for an estimated 3,000 hotel workers began last summer as the first phase of a hike for the second-largest U.S. city, largely run by Democrats. It affects about 8,000 rooms, or half of Los Angeles' large-hotel room inventory.

Hotel operators had warned the hike would force them to cut staff and services, put the brakes on new hotel projects and would drive away customers. Because of the increase, Julie Robey, a general manager at the Holiday Inn Los Angeles Gateway, south of downtown, said she had to lay off seven employees, cutting her staff to 95 full and part-time workers.

Robert Amano, executive director of the Hotel Association of Los Angeles, which opposed the increase, said the hike has led to some job cuts, but that an overall tally is not available. Many hotels have chosen to absorb the increase by upping restaurant food prices by 15 to 30 percent, he said. And he warned that smaller hotels, which do not have the same profit cushion, could face bigger challenges when they have to implement the increase this summer.

Election issue

Raising the minimum wage is a key issue for contenders in the November US presidential election, addressing a movement led by labor unions to provide better living standards for the working poor. Democratic hopefuls Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders are avid supporters. Republican front-runner and businessman Donald Trump, who owns hotels, has said US wages in general are too low - but also that it is not necessarily bad to have a low minimum wage in order to compete in a global marketplace.

LA city leaders appear to have picked the right moment for their experiment. An improving economy has helped buoy LA hotel occupancy rates to an all-time high, blunting the effect of the wage rise on the bottom line, hotel industry officials said. "When demand is high and you're running busy, you don't want to cut staff," Amano said.

More than two dozen new hotel projects are in the works, the biggest hotel development boom in Los Angeles since the 1980s, said Bruce Baltin, senior vice president at PKF Consulting, which provides analysis to the hotel industry. "Fortunately, the industry in Los Angeles is very healthy right now," Baltin said.

For workers who received the sharp wage hike, the payoff can go beyond a bigger paycheck. Jacob Loera, a bellman at a downtown Los Angeles hotel, was able to quit a second job that sometimes made his working day go from before dawn until midnight. Now, with one fulltime job at the higher minimum wage, the 39year-old father of three still earns about the same \$2,100 a month, but said he has gained something more valuable. "I get to spend quality time with my kids," Loera said. — Reuters

DUBAI: Helicopter parents texting and calling their kids behind the wheel ranks among young drivers' top perceived distractions, according to a Nielsen survey. One in three young drivers say they are distracted by texts and calls from parents and family members asking their whereabouts. The drivers say these types of interruptions are more distracting than being contacted by friends.

The Nielsen survey, commissioned by Ford, found half of these young drivers report telling their parents or family where they're going - or



that they'll be on the road - before even starting the ignition. But still, parents continue to

blow up their phones. Families of adult drivers reach out to their loved ones on the road, too. One in five drivers across all ages report being distracted when they're behind the wheel by calls and texts from family members. For these drivers, only low-visibility conditions and text messages and calls from friends rank as higher perceived distractions. Other distractions these motorists report include bad drivers, traffic, deciding what music to listen to, obstacles in the road and monitoring blind spots.

Research indicates that visual distraction is the primary contributor to distraction-related crash risks, while the research also finds that normal listening and talking among adults in the car does not raise risk nearly as much. Ford recommends all drivers keep their eyes on the road and hands on the wheel as much as possible so they are better able to react to the changing demands driving situations bring. KT: Explain Avaya's focus and services?

Areff: We focus on two areas: Software and services. Communication is the foundation of IT today and we are the major player in communication. Needless to say, IT is needed by companies, governments and organizations. The IT department will tell the future of a company. Governments rely on IT solutions to be able to provide services to their citizens.



KT: Can you talk more about the trends and transformation in the Kuwait market in terms of IT?

Areff: The biggest trend right now is the 'Internet of things'. How can we enable the 'Internet of things' in the future? How can we build the infrastructure today? Organizations also want not only to satisfy customers, but also to build relationships. If you look at the present technology landscape, a lot of people say that investment has reduced. But in Kuwait, I think, it's different. The investments here are increasing, people now are using these as an opportunity to consolidate and solidify what they have today, as infrastructure

But they also want to go ahead and see how they can make a meaningful investment today that will impact their customer's directly. When it is not driven by revenue, or cost reduction concerns but simply generated by saying that I want to provide the best service to my customers. When my customers are delighted with me, eventually my business is going to sustain and grow.

KT: It seems most of your customers all major companies? Does Avaya provide solutions to small and medium enterprises?

Areff: Yes we do. Avaya has two portfolios: one for mid-market and the upscale market which includes governments. We believe that the economy of the country is driven by the small and medium enterprises, the big enterprises are there, but the small and medium companies nowadays are demanding solutions as well. With a solution that has the same flexibility, we targeted small and medium companies. We have a significant number of them in this country and they are using our solutions. KT: So in a way, you are competing with

Moreover, it can take multi-party, you can use the video conferencing with a higher number of audiences, unlike the mobile apps. Avaya can also record and no other solution can pro-

KT: What are the major concerns in Kuwait when we talk about IT?

Areff: I think the major concern for IT businesses in Kuwait is the ROI, generally speaking. People tend to provide very high value solutions and very complex ones that the return of investment will take years to get. That is something we should be concerned about and so the ROI is a major challenge for investors. You know the environment has been changing so fast, it is not very promising for investors to get the ROI in three to five years. We at Avaya, we want it simpler, less complex and so address the solution that can show the ROI in six to eight months.

Oman Air and SATS form cargo handling joint venture

SATS will provide the requisite management and technical knowhow to the joint venture including staff training as well as reviewing of existing cargo processes and operations work flow at the



new cargo terminal in Muscat.

Paul Gregorowitsch, Oman Air's Chief Executive Officer said: "The joint venture with SATS is one of our initiatives intended to prepare for the growth in airline operations in the

AIRBNB PLEDGES HOST CRACKDOWN IN SAN FRANCISCO

SAN FRANCISCO: Airbnb launched a ing effort by the 8-year-old vacationcrackdown Saturday on some Airbnb hosts who violate San Francisco's laws on short-term rentals, the online vacation-rental service says. The popular site is pledging to investigate people who list multiple San Francisco homes on Airbnb, as well as purge its listings of hosts who have turned private homes into illegal hotels, the San Francisco Chronicle reports.

The move follows a similar self-polic-

rental giant in New York City. Chris Lehane, Airbnb's global director of public policy, said Airbnb is seeking to adapt its policies "so it serves the best interest of each city we're in."

"This is a step in that direction, to make sure that each host has only one listing in San Francisco," Lehane said. Tech booms in nearby Silicon Valley have helped create one of the most expensive housing markets in the nation

in San Francisco. Housing advocacy groups say the city's shortage of affordable homes for residents is in the thou-

Critics accuse Airbnb and other shortterm rental sites of worsening the housing shortage, by giving property owners a financial motive to convert homes into lodging for out-of-town visitors rather than residents. San Francisco toughened laws on short-term rentals last year, but city officials have pleaded with the vacation-rental sites for more information to help the city catch violators.

Airbnb has cited privacy concerns, but increasingly is indicating it will do more to police its own listings in some cities. Airbnb told the Chronicle that 1,149, or one-fifth, of its house listings in San Francisco are controlled by hosts who list more than one home for rental on the site. Local law says homeowners are allowed to list only their primary residence for short-term rentals. The company removed almost 100 questionable San Francisco listings in January, and another 118 in 2015, it said.

San Francisco's Office of Short-Term Rentals, meanwhile, served 59 notices between November and February to property owners it suspected of operating illegally. The company spent \$8 million in 2015 to defeat a ballot measure that sought to further crack down on use of the city's housing stock for vacation rentals. —AP

WILL APPLE'S FBI TUSSLE TAKE A BITE OUT OF THE BRAND?

NEW YORK: The revelation that the FBI was able to break into a secured iPhone without Apple's help won't take a bite out of Apple's brand reputation, but consumers will be looking for security

improvements soon. The Apple brand has already withstood worse. In 2014, hackers posted nude photos of Jennifer Lawrence and other celebrities after guessing their passwords and breaking into their Apple iCloud accounts. Beyond security, Apple has faced complaints that the iPhone 6 Plus bent too easily and that the iPhone 4 lost signal strength when users held it a certain way.

In each case, Apple's reputation recovered - and the company went on to sell 232 million iPhones last year. And on Thursday, crowds formed at some stores as the new iPhone SE went on sale, though the company hasn't released fig-

YouGov BrandIndex, which tracks brand perceptions, said that the Apple brand has been trending modestly positively since early March and that the FBI dropping the case had no effect on that.

And investors have not shown much concern: Apple's stock has increased 4 percent since the FBI said late Monday that it didn't need help to break into the phone. Investors have typically been more worried about whether Apple can maintain its growth as smartphone sales

Apple resisted the FBI's demands that it rewrite the iPhone's software to override safeguards against repeatedly guessing passcodes. But the FBI now says it did not need Apple's help after all in breaking into an iPhone used by a San Bernardino killer. It was an older model, but has recent iPhone software.

Tightened security

Apple is already expected to tighten security even more with its next iPhone software, likely to be announced in June and available in September. But can Apple assure its phones are unbreakable when the FBI won't reveal what technique it used?

"They have a window to address the problem, but ... there has to be news soon, with Apple saying 'Here's how the new iPhone is now Fort Knox," said Allen Adamson, founder of Brand Simple Consulting.

Apple won't comment on specific plans, but says it's constantly working to improve the security of its devices, because it knows hackers are always looking for new vulnerabilities. Apple also says it can deliver software updates quickly because it sends them directly to users. With Android, any updates have to wait for phone makers and wireless carriers to approve them. And even if the FBI doesn't disclose the technique it used, it may become outmoded as Apple continues updating its security protections.

Christopher Lehmann, managing director of branding firm Landor in San Francisco, said iPhone buyers will understand that Apple's in a business that's "always about improvement, evolving and being agile about how you approach technology." In addition, Apple likely got some kudos from consumers for stand-

ing its ground against the government. And Apple benefits from a quick resolution. Scott Galloway, clinical professor of marketing at NYU Stern School of Business, said Apple risked public sentiment turning against the company as people became more informed about the case, and particularly if Apple lost. —AP

HUGE GLOBAL EXERCISE CONTEST SHOWS HEALTHY POTENTIAL

CHICAGO: A workplace exercise challenge using pedometers and social media in a global competition shows potential to improve health in a study involving almost 70,000 employees in 64 countries. In the program, office teams compete against each other or with groups at companies in other countries to see who can take the most daily steps during a 100-day challenge. Workers post progress on a special social media website - for motivation and to egg on rival teams.

The study found workers on average increased their daily activity by 3,500 steps, exercised for almost one extra day per week, reduced sitting time by about 45 minutes daily, and lost about three pounds (1.4 kilograms) during the contests. Whether the changes were lasting isn't known. The research was presented yesterday in Chicago at the American College of Cardiology's annual meeting and published online in the group's medical journal.

The skinny

Dr Anand Ganesan, a cardiologist at Flinders University in Adelaide, Australia, led the study. Researchers analyzed 2012-14 data on yearly contests involving the Stepathlon program, created by Stepathlon Lifestyle Pvt Ltd, a Mumbai, India-based wellness company. Participation was voluntary and increased each year; more than 20,000 blue-collar and white-collar workers worldwide were involved in the 2014 challenge. Not all completed their programs although the number of dropouts isn't known, Ganesan said. Full data were available for almost 37,000 workers, a little over half the

enrollees. Workers in developed and developing nations participated, mostly in Asia but including Europe, North and South America, and Africa. Ganesan said that suggests similar programs could have benefits in countries with poor access to preventive health care. "Getting people to be physically active and change their behavior is hugely challenging" worldwide, Ganesan said. He said the results show that using technology in a clever way has broad appeal and might be able to help fight the world's No. 1 killer: Heart disease causes 18 million deaths globally each year.

Another view

Dr Jeffrey Kuvin of Tufts Medical Center, vice chairman of the cardiology meeting, called the program novel and the results tantalizing given that short-term benefits were seen on such a large scale, although he said more follow-up is needed. "If we can increase exercise and decrease sitting ... clearly we are going to make some headway in reducing cardiovascular risk," he said.

A testimonial

Nikita Sharma, 28, a customer service agent for DHL Express in Mumbai, participated in her company's Stepathlon challenge last year. In an email message, she said the program motivated her to change her lifestyle. During the program she achieved 12,000 steps and 45 minutes of exercise daily, including brisk walking, jogging and cycling. She has stuck with it and lost almost 8 pounds (3.6 kilograms). "I'm more energetic and have built better stamina as well," Sharma said.

The limitations

The study only looked at short-term results, so it isn't known if the program leads to lasting long-term health benefits. The study also lacked information on any changes in workers with high blood pressure, unhealthy cholesterol levels and other conditions that can lead to heart disease, although exercise is known to benefit those conditions.

Industry ties

Ganesan said he has no financial ties to Stepathlon. A top company executive is among the study co-authors but Ganesan said Stepathlon wasn't involved in funding or the study analysis. Several other co-authors have received consulting or research fees from makers of pedometers. — AP

OIL SPILL TESTS ON ICE PROVE ARCTIC QUESTS RISKY

'If oil is spilt into the Arctic Ocean, recovering it will be an impossible, task'

TORNIO, Finland: The skimmer is lowered from the rear of the icebreaker, its weight pushing massive pieces of ice under the water and forcing the spilt oil up to the surface, where the sticky black goo can be sucked up. Luckily, this is just a test: as the world's superpowers eye the lucrative Arctic region with growing interest, unprecedented oil spill clean-up tests in icy Finnish conditions reveal just how hazardous and challenging an accident in the Arctic's pristine sea ice could be.

Emergency crews could face total darkness, extreme storms and shifting pack ice, racing against time as the oil puts endangered polar bears, seals and other wildlife at risk. With countries and companies increasingly venturing into the polar region the melting ice caused by global warming has opened up new shipping routes and potential oil, gas and mineral deposits-the risk of an environmental catastrophe has skyrocketed, worrying ecologists and authorities. "If oil is spilt into the Arctic Ocean, recovering it will be a difficult, if not impossible, task," the Pew Research Center, a Washington-based nonpartisan think tank, said in a recent report.

"The challenges go beyond extreme cold, freezing spray, snow, extended periods of low light, strong winds, dense fog, sea ice, strong currents, and dangerous sea conditions to include the limited infrastructure that could support an emergency response," it said. Fearing an oil spill in its own heavily-trafficked, icecovered Baltic Sea, Finnish authorities are racing against the clock to develop an efficient response to an oil spill in icy conditions. On any other day, Antti Rajaniemi, the 37-year-old captain of Finnish icebreaker "Ahto", would be clearing the way in the country's northern ports, where even the largest vessels can get trapped within hours.

But now he's on a special mission. A thick layer of solid ice groans and crunches before giving in and breaking into pieces, as the bow of the small but forceful icebreaker forges a path. Finland's stateowned icebreaking operator Arctia has set itself the goal of being able to recover oil in the harshest of conditions: when a lid of thick ice covers the sea.

"We have to separate the oil from the ice out on the sea since all this ice can't be taken ashore," Rune Hogstrom of Finnish oil spill response company Lamor explained to AFP, invited aboard the icebreaker in the northern Baltic Sea on a recent numbingly cold day. "An oil spill here is a real challenge, when you think we've got half a meter (1.6 feet) of ice, and if you break the ice up then the oil just gets mixed in even more," he said. The shallow waters here provide unique conditions for the tests, with brackish water and thick ice, Arctia said. While Finland is not an oil producing country, it fears a leaking oil tanker could cause irreparable damage to the Baltic Sea's fragile ecosystem. There are around 350,000 ship crossings a year in the Baltic, even though 45 percent of its surface is covered by ice an average winter.

Hindered by ice

A typical oil spill in water is usually skimmed, dispersed with chemicals, contained with booms or even burnt off. Similar methods could be used in frozen waters, but recovering the oil is severely complicated by the black goo floating under the ice-hidden from sight-which risks mixing with the crushed ice around an icebreaker trying to locate it. "When you recover oil mixed with ice, only one percent of it is oil and 99 percent is ice. You need to be able to sort out the ice," Rune Hogstrom explains. As he speaks, engineers brave the mercury at minus 15 degrees Celsius (5 decrees Fahrenheit) to descend onto the ice, drilling holes to inject harmless red test liquid to mimic oil.

Hogstrom said the skimmer deployed from the rear of the vessel was capable of separating oil from ice, but more tests were needed to figure out how to use the icebreaker's propeller flows to suction the oil toward the skimmer. Finland has been developing this technology for 20 years, and a 2015 study by the International Association of Oil and Gas Producers found the method being tested now to be one of the most suitable methods for mechanical recovery. Other technologies being developed elsewhere involve different types of skimmers to collect the oil.

In the US and Canada, research has focused on burning off the oil in open water, but that can be difficult in densely packed ice. Environmental organizations like Greenpeace have expressed concerns about the elevated risks of Arctic ventures. "The ice has melted so fast that oil drilling and industrial fishing are now spreading to regions where they weren't possible before and where there aren't any rules yet," head of Greenpeace Finland Sini Harkki said. Anglo-Dutch oil group Shell abandoned its test drills in Alaska last September and Russia's Rosneft has put its own project in the Kara Sea on hold due to the plunging oil price, but Russian Gazprom Neft and Lukoil continue to drill in Russia's Arctic regions. — AFP

New cholesterol methods NEEDED IN WAKE OF FAILED DRUGS

NEW YORK: New ways of controlling cholesterol, including possibly directly injecting "good" HDL cholesterol into patients, need to be studied following the failure of promising treatments from Eli Lilly, Pfizer Inc and Roche Holding AG, according to top heart researchers. Lilly in October halted a 12,000patient study of its experimental drug evacetrapib, an oral medication that in smaller earlier studies slashed "bad" LDL cholesterol and doubled levels of HDL. But improved cholesterol levels did not prevent heart attacks and strokes, diminishing hopes for the approach to treating heart disease - by raising HDL through blockage of a protein called CETP.

Roche in 2012 scrapped its own CETP inhibitor after it also failed to help patients. Pfizer's similar drug was discontinued in 2006 after being linked to deaths in trials. Although Merck & Co continues to develop its own CETP inhibitor in a 30,000-patient study expected to be completed next year, researchers on Sunday said the failures of the Lilly, Roche and Pfizer drugs bode poorly

"Merck's drug is the fourth shot on goal for CETP inhibitors, but with disappointment or lack of success for the other agents you have to be increasingly pessimistic" about

the class of drugs, said Dr. Stephen Nicholls, deputy director of the South Australian Health and Medical Research Institute in Adelaide, Australia. He was a lead investigator for the failed trial of Lilly's drug. Nicholls and Dr Steve Nissen, the head of cardiology for the Cleveland Clinic, who co-lead the evacetrapib study, on Sunday reviewed the baffling evacetrapib data in a presentation at the annual scientific sessions of the American College of Cardiology in Chicago.

"This drug lowered LDL by 37 percent and raised HDL by 130 percent and had absolutely no effect" on preventing deaths and heart attacks, Nissen said in an interview. Although other ways of raising HDL cholesterol might eventually prove protective, Nissen said all attempts so far have been fruitless. Nicholls said he remains hopeful of future HDL therapies and is testing whether artificial HDL can be made in the laboratory and injected directly into high-risk heart patients. "There is enthusiasm it may be able to shrink plaque" in heart arteries, he said. He said he is studying variations of that approach with French drugmaker Cerenis Therapeutics and the Medicines Company. Nicholls said another possible approach would be to instruct the liver to make more HDL. — Reuters

ZIKA MOSQUITO'S HABITS FORCE NEW STRATEGY BY US CITIES, STATES

CHICAGO: US states and cities need to adopt a different mosquito-fighting strategy to battle the species carrying the Zika virus as an outbreak that started in Brazil heads north with warmer weather in the coming weeks, health officials said on Friday.

The World Health Organization declared a global health emergency in February as the virus spread rapidly in the Americas, citing Zika's link to the birth defect microcephaly and Guillain-Barre syndrome, an autoimmune mosquito species responsible for spreading the virus by biting people lives in and around homes, making traditional evening insecticide fogging campaigns from sprayers mounted on trucks an ineffective option, US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention officials said.

CDC Director Dr Thomas Frieden said health departments need to take a "four corners approach," targeting the Aedes aegypti mosquitoes indoors and outdoors as well as focusing on killing both larvae and adult insects. "We think we can at least have significant knockdown and potentially significant disease control," Frieden told state and local health officials and others taking part in a "Zika Action Plan Summit" at the agency's Atlanta headquarters.

Most mosquito abatement efforts in US states target nuisance mosquitoes, those that bite at dusk and ruin picnics and barbecues but pose little public health threat. But Aedes aegypti is a daytime biter that dines exclusively on humans, biting several people in a single blood meal. Aedes aegypti has been dubbed "the cockroach of mosquitoes" because it is so hard to kill, Frieden said.

"Unfortunately, in some parts of the US, it has widespread resistance to some insecticides. But that doesn't mean it's impossible," Frieden said. Zika has been linked to thousands of suspected microcephaly cases in Brazil. The virus is spreading rapidly in Puerto Rico, a tropical island territory of the United States that is expected to be hardest hit by the current outbreak. Zika is expected to reach southern US states soon as temperatures rise in spring and summer months. As in Puerto Rico, the main focus of the US plan is to protect pregnant women from exposure to Zikacarrying mosquitoes.

'patchwork' mosquito control

Dr Lyle Petersen, director of the CDC's Division of Vector-Borne Disease, said US mosof mosquito-control districts that are coordinated and funded locally. Some may not be linked to local health departments. Most of these programs, Petersen said, are "primarily funded to control nuisance mosquitoes rather than to control disease-spreading mosqui-

Surveillance systems in most states and municipalities are geared toward night-biting mosquitoes that breed in larger bodies of water, and are not likely to detect Aedes aegypti, which breeds in flower pots, tires, trash and small pools of water. Unlike many other types of mosquitoes, Aedes aegypti's eggs can dry out and cling to container surfaces, waiting for the next rain to revive them.

At the meeting, Petersen showed a map of mosquito abatement districts in US states. One attendee said "abatement" in his area consisted of a man with a pickup truck who plowed snow in the winter and did some mosquito spraying during warmer months. Many officials expressed concerns about the cost of efforts to deal with Zika. Daniel Kass, New York City's deputy commissioner for environmental health, estimated the city, which has high volumes of travelers and prior outbreaks of Yellow fever and a recent case of dengue, will spend \$5 million to \$6 million on Zika preparedness. Aedes aegypti is not common in New York City, but it is home to Aedes albopictus, another mosquito thought capable of carrying Zika. — Reuters

STATIN, BLOOD PRESSURE DRUG SLASH HEALTH RISK IN THOSE WITH HYPERTENSION

CHICAGO: Patients with high blood pressure and moderate risk of heart disease slashed their long-term risk of heart attack and stroke 40 percent by taking a blood pressure medication as well as a statin cholesterol fighter, according to a large global study that could change medical practice. Results from the trial, called HOPE-3, could prod far more doctors to add a statin to blood pressure therapy for such patients who have no prior history of heart attack or stroke, researchers said. The data was presented on Saturday at the annual scientific sessions of the American College of Cardiology

To enroll in the trial, patients had to have at least one risk factor for heart disease such as obesity or smoking, in addition to being over 60 for women and over 55 for men. "Intermediate-risk people with hypertension had a clear benefit when taking both a statin and an agent that lowers blood pressure," Dr Salim Yusuf, a professor of cardiology at McMaster University in Ontario, Canada who headed the 12,000-patient global study, said in an interview. Patients with systolic blood pressure of 140 and higher were deemed in the study to have high blood pressure. They experienced a 40 percent reduced risk of heart attack and stroke over a six-year period when taking AstraZeneca Plc's Crestor statin as well as a combination tablet containing blood pressure treatment candesartan and the diuretic hydrochlorothiazide.

Patients with normal or low systolic pressure had the same approximate 25 percent reduction in cardiovascular events as seen among patients in one arm of the study who took only statins. Yusuf said the trial underscores that if a patient at moderate heart risk has high blood pressure, defined as 140 or higher, "give them both a statin and a blood pressure medication as a matter of course." He said statins are not automatically given now to patients with hypertension that are at only moderate risk of heart attack or stroke.

Yusuf's trial included research centers in China, India, Latin America, Africa and Canada, but not the United States because of far greater research costs there. The trial was funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research and AstraZeneca. A separate study published in November found that lowering blood pressure to below 120 dramatically reduced heart failure and risk of death in adults aged 50 and older. But the five-year US government-sponsored study of more than 9,300 patients showed a higher rate of adverse side effects, including kidney damage, in the aggressively treated patients. — Reuters

would be required to carry warning labels about possible side effects under a bill proposed by a Republican lawmaker. His bill, which is up for a House committee vote Monday, doesn't specify what warnings should be on the products, leaving it to the state health department to decide. But Kay said he would like to see warnings about how marijuana can cause drowsiness and impaired driving, and that it can affect pregnancies.

Medical marijuana sales began in Illinois in November under a 4-year pilot program, which Kay opposed. However, he said he believes it will eventually become permanent and wants the labeling to be in place as soon as possible. "It's better coming sooner or later that we get the appropriate warnings on the package or whatever this is being dispensed in," he said.

IN WEST, REGION OF GUNS AND SUICIDE, OUTREACH TO CURB DEATHS

'MAKE SURE GUNS ARE LOCKED AND OUT OF THE REACH OF SOMEONE WHO'S IN CRISIS'

MONTROSE, Colorado: Keith Carey is a gunsmith in Montrose, a town with a frontier flavor set amid the mesas of western Colorado. He's a staunch, though soft-spoken, defender of the right to bear arms. Yet now he's a willing recruit in a fledgling effort to see if the gun community itself - sellers and owners of firearms, operators of shooting ranges - can help Colorado and other Western states reduce their highest-in-the-nation suicide rates. "Suicide is a tragedy no matter how it's done," said Carey, whose adult daughter killed herself with a mix of alcohol and antidepressants a few years ago on the East Coast. However, he sees the logic in trying gun-specific prevention strategies in towns like Montrose, where guns are an integral part of dai-

"It's very expedient for people to commit suicide by a firearm, without too much forethought," Carey said. "Unfortunately, it's generally effective." At the urging of a local police commander, Carey agreed last year to participate in the Gun Shop Project, a state-funded program in which gun sellers and range operators in five western Colorado counties were invited to help raise awareness about suicide. It's a tentative but promising bid to open up a conversation on a topic that's been virtually taboo in these Western states: the intersection of

guns and suicide.

Carey's shop counter now displays wallet-sized cards with information about a suicide hotline. A poster by the door offers advice about ways to keep guns away from friends or relatives at risk of killing themselves. Carey says some customers take materials home, or ask a few questions. The conversations tend to be brief. "Suicide is one of those morose subjects that a lot of us don't want to talk about," he said. "But it's all too common. I believe any method of suicide prevention is worth a good hard try."

Rocky Mountain

Across the US, suicides account for nearly two-thirds of all gun deaths far outnumbering gun homicides. In 2014, according to federal data, there were 33,599 firearm deaths; 21,334 of them were suicides. That figure represents about half of all suicides that vear: but in several western Colorado counties, and in some other Rocky Mountain states with high gun-ownership rates, more than 60 percent of suicides involve firearms. Along with Alaska, the states with the highest rates form a contiguous bloc -Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, Nevada, Colorado, Utah and New Mexico. All

have age-adjusted suicide rates at least 50 percent higher than the of national rate of 12.93 suicides per

Commonly cited factors include the isolation and economic hard times in rural areas of these states. There's also belief that a self-reliant frontier mindset deters some Westerners from seeking help when depression sinks in. "We embrace the cowboy mentality," says Jarrod Hindman, director of Colorado's Office of Suicide Prevention. "If you're suffering, suck it up, pick yourself up by your boot straps. But that doesn't work very well if you're suicidal." Underlying all these explanations is the fact that firearms are more ubiquitous in the West than in most other parts of the country.

Gun control

Catherine Barber, a suicide prevention expert at the Harvard School of Public Health, says residents of gunowning homes are at higher risk of suicide than other people - simply because a suicide attempt is more likely to involve a gun. According to federal estimates, suicide attempts involving firearms succeed 85 percent of the time, compared to less than 10 percent of attempts involving drug overdoses and several other methods. "It's not that gun owners are more suicidal," Barber argues. "It's that they're more likely to die in the event that they become suicidal, because they are using a gun."

Colorado's Gun Shop Project is modeled after a program pioneered in New Hampshire. Barber helped design the initiative and hopes collaboration on firearm suicide prevention can spread nationwide. "In the past, people shut up about this issue because they thought raising it meant raising the issue of gun control," she said. "It makes so much more sense to look at gun owners as part of the solution." Hindman said that when he joined the state health department in 2004, talking about the role of firearms in suicide was discouraged. It's still a sensitive topic, he said, but some funding has materialized for gun-specific initia-

tives

In Montrose, Police Commander Keith Caddy has been around guns since childhood. Now he's doing outreach for the Gun Shop Project - and most of the businesses he has visited agreed to display suicide-awareness materials once they were assured it wasn't a gun-takeaway program in disguise. "It's my duty to protect the community I serve," Caddy said. "If I can go out there and spend a little time talking to the gun shops, maybe the reward will be saving someone's life."

Suicide presents a distinctive challenge for shooting ranges: Occasionally, someone will rent a gun, then use it to commit suicide. At the Family Shooting Center in Denver, there have been three such incidents, including two since Doug Hamilton began managing the range in 2004. Hamilton is open to letting his staff get suicide-prevention training, though he's unsure it would help. Those who killed themselves at his range exhibited no signs of stress beforehand. "Suicide prevention brochures aren't something that anyone's going to pick up who has come out to our range to kill themselves," he said.

The medical community

Such challenges are familiar to Dr Michael Victoroff, a Denver-area physician whose leisure-time passion is competitive shooting. He was at the Family Shooting Center in Denver when one of the suicides occurred there. Victoroff belongs to the American Medical Association and the National Rifle Association, and has qualms about both. "The medical community has been content not to know anything about gun culture and gun safety," said Victoroff. As for the NRA, he'd like to see suicide prevention highlighted in its training materials. Over the years, firearm suicide has not been a high-profile issue for the NRA; it worries that the topic might be used to advance a gun-control agenda. Though the NRA has no position on Colorado's Gun Shop Project, it has endorsed a bill in Washington state encouraging gun dealers to participate in suicide prevention efforts, said spokeswoman Jennifer Baker. — AP

FILM TO HELP FAMILIES PREVENT LGBT YOUTH SUICIDES

NEW YORK: When families reject their lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT) children, it dramatically increases the youths' risk for suicide. Experts hope a new film aimed at families - religious families in particular - will help ease the tensions that drive those youngsters to kill themselves. The 20-minute film, called "Families are Forever," follows the journey of a devout Mormon family whose 13-year-old son comes out as gay. The family discusses its reactions, decisions and how they reconciled their beliefs with their son's announcement.

The film and supporting materials, part of a growing series, quickly get to the heart of the matter, said Caitlin Ryan, director of the Family Acceptance Project at San Francisco State University, which produced the film. "We have to give people a way to understand how . . . they can support a LGBT child even if it's not in sync with their religious beliefs or cultural values" Ryan told Reuters Health.

The Family Acceptance Project had previously found that LGBT youth who report high levels of family rejection are more than eight times more likely to report attempting suicide, compared to similar kids whose families don't reject them. Family acceptance of LGBT children is tied to better physical and mental health, however.

The multimedia package, available in English and Spanish, is meant to help families identify and change behaviors that make their LGBT child feel rejected and to increase supportive behaviors, Ryan said. Even though parents may be engaging in rejecting behaviors out of care or concern, they are nevertheless "contributing to health risks, conflict and estrangement in the family," said Ryan.

The film and its accompanying discussion guide and family education workbook were added in March to the Suicide Prevention Resource Center Best Practice Registry. Ann Hass, a senior consultant to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, told Reuters Health that the registry is a collection of research-based and peer-reviewed suicide prevention programs, selected in "a pretty rigorous process." "The addition of Caitlin Ryan's work to the registry is such a step forward in terms of the ability people in communities to do some LGBT-related suicide prevention," said

So far, this is the only LGBT-related program in the registry to incorporate faith-based themes. Rather than writing off religious families as culturally or socially conservative, Ryan said, "We have to understand that all of these families share some common fear and concerns and challenges." — Reuters

EUROPE GIVES GREEN LIGHT TO FIRST GENE THERAPY FOR CHILDREN

LONDON: The world's first life-saving gene therapy for children, developed by Italian scientists and GlaxoSmithKline, has been recommended for approval in Europe, boosting the pioneering technology to fix faulty genes. The European Medicines Agency (EMA) said on Friday it had endorsed the therapy, called Strimvelis, for a tiny number of children with ADA Severe Combined Immune Deficiency (ADA-SCID) for whom no matching bone marrow donor is available.

Around 15 children a year are born in Europe with the ultra-rare genetic disorder, which leaves them unable to make a type of white blood cell. They rarely survive beyond two years unless their immune function is restored with a suitable bone marrow transplant. SCID is sometimes known as "bubble baby" disease, since children born with it have immune systems so weak they must live in germ-free environments.

Strimvelis is expected to secure formal marketing authorization from the European Commission in a couple of months, making it the second gene therapy to be approved in Europe, after UniQure's Glybera, which treats a rare adult blood disorder. The US Food and Drug Administration has yet to approve any gene therapies but a growing number of US biotech companies, such as Bluebird Bio, have products in development. Other large pharmaceutical companies are also eyeing the field, including Bristol-Myers Squibb, which has a tie-up with UniQure.

Many setbacks

Research into gene therapy goes back a quarter of a century but the

field has experienced many setbacks, including the high-profile death of an American patient in 1999 and some disastrous clinical trial results in the late 1990s and early 2000s.

Now, though, optimism is building, helped by the discovery of better ways to carry replacement genes into cells. Martin Andrews, head of GlaxoSmithKline's rare diseases unit, believes the technology is proving itself, although it remains at an early stage of development. "We're on page one of chapter one of a new medicine text book," he told Reuters.

A host of challenges still need to be overcome, including the complexity of delivering a product like GSK's new treatment, which requires bone marrow cells to be taken from the patient, processed and injected back. Trickiest of all may be pricing, given the tiny market for a therapy like Strimvelis. UniQure's Glybera made history in 2014 as the first drug to carry a \$1 million price tag. GSK is not putting a price on its product but a source close to the company said that, if approved, Strimvelis would cost "very significantly less than \$1 million".

GSK has several other gene therapies under development with researchers at Fondazione Telethon and Ospedale San Raffaele in Italy, including treatments for metachromatic leukodystrophy and Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome that could be submitted for regulatory approval in the next couple of years. Its Strimvelis treatment for ADA-SCID is also being lined up for submission to US regulators, although Andrews said this would not happen before the end of next year. — Reuters

This is an appeal on behalf of Marshal Byiers, a Scottish gentleman who lived in Kuwait during the 1980s. While here, he lived with his family in Fahaheel city, more specifically, in a building owned by Khalif Al-Fulaij.

Marshall worked for a company called EW Sable, and was trapped in Kuwait during the Iraqi invasion. He was held hostage by the Iraqi forces for a brief period of time. He was eventually put in contact with members of the Kuwait Resistance by Larry Banks at the British Embassy. While Mr Byiers never met the resistance fighters in person, they spoke over the phone and they provided him with food, cigarettes, and a small radio at great personal risk to them self. The men who knew him would likely be in their 50s now. His personal friend was a Kuwaiti gentleman names Sami Al

Dabbous, who we're having trouble locating.

After the war, Marshall returned to Scotland. We are a group of filmmakers who are currently working on a documentary that narrates Marshall's story, and, after 26 years, we are flying him back to Kuwait for the first time, for what will probably be quite an emotional closure to his journey.

Marshall would really like to meet the person that helped him during the Iraqi occupation. Marshall is due to arrive to Kuwait on April 4-9. 


Thomas Cohen talks with grief over Geldof's death

Argentine jazz great 'Gato' **Barbieri** dies

rgentine-born jazz saxophonist Leandro "Gato" Barbieri, who won a Grammy for music in the 1972 film "Last Tango in Paris," died on Saturday, New York's Blue Note Jazz Club said. He was 83. "Today we've lost an icon, pioneer and dear friend," the legendary club said in a statement posted on Twitter. "Gato's significant contributions to music and the arts were an inspiration to us all." Barbieri, born on November 28, 1932, recorded 50 albums during his long career. His last performance was on November 23, 2015, Blue Note said. He began to play saxophone professionally as a teenager in clubs in Buenos Aires. His nickname "Gato"-cat in Spanish-came early on and his long career "covered virtually the entire jazz landscape," according to his Blue Note biography. Barbieri became known to a wider audience when director Bernardo Bertolucci chose his trademark tenor saxophone sound as the music for the steamy "Last Tango in Paris," a Hollywood movie starring Marlon Brando and Maria Schneider. Barbieri's final album, "Shadow," released in September 2002, won a Billboard Latin Jazz Album of the Year award. Last year he received a Latin Grammy lifetime achievement award. "Barbieri created a rebellious but highly accessible musical style, combining contemporary jazz with Latin American genres and incorporating elements of instrumental pop," the Latin Recording Academy said when it announced the award.

From limos to junk, quirky museums tell Beijing's history

tuffed into a tiny room off an alleyway are items that Wang Jinming readily admits were put out with the garbage: Paper string, a needle holder, a metal pancake maker built for thrusting into a fire. "These objects all look quite old and shabby," he said. "But they record real history." Wang's Beijing Old Items Exhibition in the heart of old Beijing is one of dozens of private museums that dot the capital's backstreets and its suburbs. Their collections feature the grand and mundane from items salvaged from the garbage to a limousine in which Mao Zedong once rode.

Entering these private museums is to peel off a largely forgotten layer of Beijing's recent history. While state-run museums seek mainly to legitimize the ruling Communist Party through its own highly selective interpretation of history, the capital's private museums are born from their founders' hobbies and obsessions, along with a sense of duty to keep alive a little bit of history others might dismiss as trivial. "If you throw it on the street, people would say 'What's this?' and maybe think it's useless and throw it away," said Wang, gesturing around the room packed with hundreds of household items and street objects dating from the 1900s to the 1970s. "But we think it's culture."

Street vendors

Wang delights in telling visitors to guess what the objects are in their hands. They might include a popsicle holder used by street vendors or a bucket-shaped iron heated by charcoal. All form part of the collection that

Wang and two co-founders began in the 1980s after asking foreign visitors why they were so interested in buying old everyday

"They said, 'To collect.' Now if you go to someone's home you probably can't find such things," Wang said. Picking up a doughnutshaped metal bell, Wang explained that before Beijing had many hospitals, itinerant doctors used to roam the streets. "When you heard this sound, the doctor was walking in the street, available, ringing the bell," he said. Liu Chen, 27, first visited the museum after reading about it on social media and has returned several times with friends.

"It's not like big state-owned museums. You don't need to buy a ticket to enter some sort of grand hall and stroll through different chambers," he said. "Here many of the old objects displayed might have been the kind of things used by Mr Wang himself when he was a kid, so you can feel his enthusiasm, which is the key thing that distinguishes it from other

Motoring history

As China grows richer, wealthy citizens, banks and private businesses have invested in Chinese art and started museums to display their wealth or patriotism. Others, such as Luo Wenyou, opened their collections after their pastimes evolved into callings. In 1998, when he already owned about 70 old cars, Luo took part in an 800-kilometer (500-mile) rally from the northeastern city of Dalian to Beijing, his iconic Red Flag sedan the only Chinese car in

favor with Mao.

the event. Having learned about vintage car associations and museums outside China, and inspired by shouts of "long live Red Flag" as he pulled up to Tiananmen Square, Luo decided he was honor-bound to preserve the legacy of China's early motoring history.

"I had a karting track, a transport company and a garage. After the rally I sold them off cheaply in order to immediately start a vintage car association and later found the museum, to fill the gap," said Luo. "I felt this was my personal duty." His museum opened in 2009 and he now boasts more than 200 vintage Chinese and foreign cars. Some of Luo's cars have stories from China's recent history. They include a car Mao refused to ride in until the brand's Romanized name on the hood was replaced with Chinese characters and a car found in an overgrown patch of grass that had been assigned to former President Liu Shaoqi. The latter vehicle still had broken windows from when Liu was pursued by Red Guards during the Cultural Revolution after falling out of

Pockets of weirdness

Luo lives at the site with his wife so he can open up outside normal hours for visitors traveling from afar. "Even if just one person comes we will open, even though the entrance fee won't cover the electricity," he said. Private collections like Luo's offer a welcome alternative to state museums that seek to draw the visitor into a narrative about the greatness of China and the necessity of the Communist Party's leadership, said Philip Tinari, director of the Ullens Center for Contemporary Art in Beijing.

"You don't really find publicly supported pockets of weirdness," Tinari said. Ma Weidu opened China's first private museum in 1996, filling it with antiques bought cheaply in the late 1970s and 80s from Beijing residents eager for cash to buy refrigerators, TVs and washing machines. "I could buy 10 average pieces of art for 65 yuan (\$10)," said Ma. In those early days, his most valuable acquisition was a bowl made in an imperial kiln during the reign of the Qing dynasty emperor Qianlong about 250 years ago, Ma said. Purchased for just 6 yuan (less than \$1) at the time, it could be worth as much as 600,000 yuan (\$92,000) if sold today, he said.

Ma's Guanfu Museum now has three branches across China with two more opening this year. Ma himself has become a TV personality, hosting programs teaching antique hunters how to discern between real treasures and fakes. Ever keen to attract more visitors, Ma, a cat lover, recently named 20 felines as assistant curators. "A lot of people who come to the museum ... are more interested in cats than culture," said Ma. "But some may come here because of the cats and in doing so learn something about antiques." — AP

Stapleton, Bryan, Lambert set for ACM Awards

hris Stapleton dominated at the Grammys and the Country Music Association Awards, but will he repeat at the Academy of Country Music Awards on Sunday? Yes and no. Stapleton is the leading nominee with seven, but he's not up for the top award: entertainer of the year. Instead, he will compete for

album, song and male vocalist of the year. He won new male vocalist of the year in an early announcement.

The singer-songwriter has a strong chance to win big at the MGM Grand Garden Arena in Las Vegas after collecting two Grammys in February and three CMAs in November, when he also had a show-stopping and memorable performance alongside Justin Timberlake. For entertainer of the year, reigning champ Luke Bryan will battle Garth Brooks, Jason Aldean, Eric Church and Miranda Lambert. A win for Lambert would make her the first women to win the honor since Taylor Swift in 2012.

Bryan will also host this year's awards show with Dierks Bentley, a spot usually reserved for Blake Shelton. The hosts will also perform during the live telecast. Shelton, Carrie Underwood, Sam Hunt, Florida Georgia Line, Kenny Chesney and Tim McGraw will also hit the stage. Collaborative performances will also take place, including Dolly Parton and Katy Perry; Miranda Lambert with Billy Gibbons and Keith Urban; Little Big Town featuring Trombone Shorty; and Kelsea Ballerini with Nick Jonas.

Cam, who will also perform, is second most nominated act with six thanks to her Grammy-nominated hit "Burning House." Church is also nominated for six awards and will perform. His surprise album, "Mr Misunderstood," is nominated for album of the year along with efforts from Stapleton, Hunt, Thomas Rhett and Chris Young. Presenters include Kiefer Sutherland, who is working on a country album; British actor Tom Hiddleston, who portrays Hank Williams in biopic, "I Saw the Light"; Miss America Betty Cantrell; and singers Kacey Musgraves, Darius Rucker, Martina McBride and Jake Owen. Additional performers include Stapleton, Aldean, Rhett, Brett Eldredge, Charles Kelley, Cole Swindell and Old Dominion. The 51st ACM Awards will air live on CBS at 8 pm Eastern. — AP

Peace and love live again as singer Donovan hits the road

■he folk singer Donovan has a secret plan for world peace. It involves ukuleles, meditation and his old friends Paul McCartney and Ringo Starr. "We are helping a great guy who is getting Israeli and Palestinian children together to play ukuleles for peace," he told AFP on a visit to the French capital. "Imagine if we could get them to meditate together too. That is our secret weapon for peace. We are already doing it with Catholic and

Protestant kids in Belfast." The sixties ended nearly half a century ago but its utopian dreams of a better world burn on in the man who penned such psychedelic hits as "Mellow Yellow" and "Sunshine Superman". At nearly 70, Donovan is on the road again, playing to audiences across Europe in what he calls his "Retrospective" tour. Sitting on stage crossed legged on a pile of sheepskins with just his acoustic guitar, it is as if flower power had never ended. "After the concerts people say, 'But he's 70. How can he sit for two hours like that?'

It is all the more remarkable when you consider that he spent his childhood battling polio. "There's a secret," said Donovan with an impish twinkle in his eye. That secret is the transcendental meditation and other Eastern spiritual techniques Donovan learned in India at the feet of Maharishi Mahesh Yogi. It was Donovan who introduced The Beatles and the Beach Boys to the guru. And like the surviving Beatles, he is still a believer.

'Yellow Submarine'

During that famous 1968 trip to the Maharishi's ashram with the actress Mia Farrow, John Lennon wrote "Dear Prudence" for her younger sister, and Donovan taught him and McCartney his finger-picking and clawhammer guitar styles. Donovan is the first to acknowledge that his sixties exploits make him look like a musical Baron Munchhuasen. Not only was he the first major pop star to be busted for cannabis, but he helped McCartney finish "Yellow Submarine", brought the three founding members of Led Zeppelin together on his hit "Hurdy Gurdy Man", and wrote the famous placards in Dylan's "Subterranean Homesick Blues" video with the Beat poet Allen Ginsberg.

A friend of Joan Baez, he was once even touted by

the press as a serious rival to Dylan, with the American singer opening a newspaper in the 1967 documentary "Don't Look Back" and declaring, "Who is this Donovan?" "It was all nonsense. There was no rivalry between us," Donovan said. In fact, it was Dylan who introduced him to The Beatles. While his friends went on to become musical megastars, Donovan's own star waned in the 1970s with his more mystical style earning him the derision of the punk generation. Though the likes of Belle and Sebastian, St Etienne and Badly Drawn Boy now all cite him as an influence, the insults clearly hurt. "They said I was an old hippy-guilty!" he joked, holding up his hands.

'I am a poet' "I didn't want to be a pop star, or a folk star. I was a poet and I still am," the Scottish-born singer insisted. Instead Donovan, who today lives in County Cork, Ireland, returned to his Celtic roots, to the songs he grew up with in a Glasgow tenement block sung by his Irish mother and aunts and his poetry-mad father. "People say I play the guitar like the harp. It is because I come from the remains of that bardic Gaelic tradition.

"I am a mix of the Irish and the Scots. The Beatles were the Irish in Liverpool. Oasis, The Smiths and the Happy Mondays were the Irish in Manchester, the Everly Brothers learned to sing from their Irish granny. Elvis Presley was Scots Irish and Woody Guthrie had Scottish roots. I am part of that tradition. We are very strong with the music and the poetry." With mindfulness the big new thing and singer songwriters again at the top of the charts, Donovan feels he is now swim-

ming with the tide rather than against it. "People keep asking me, 'You thought peace and love would save the world, but it didn't, did it?' "But I say, the 1960s were not an answer, they were the guestion... and it still holds particularly about the way we are treating the planet," the singer insisted. "All the difficulties in the outer world begin in the inner world. That's where we need to begin." Donovan tours Germany in April before concerts in London in May and Paris and Ireland in June. — AFP



ou may not always like her aesthetic, her candor or the politics of her clients, but Zaha Hadid, the star architect who died suddenly in Miami on March 31, has left a dark hole in the world of architecture. An inimitable mind, Hadid often proposed dazzling "swoopy" avant-garde structures, earning the nickname the "Queen of the Curve." Her singular stardom broke through the male-dominated profession's stereotypes of architectural career paths for women, Arabs, emigres or anyone who has ever felt like a square peg in a round hole. When she passed away at 65, Hadid was a rarity, a celebrity, and an anointed Dame.

Hadid established herself by winning high-profile cultural commissions and was bolstered by architecture honors like her induction into the Order of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth in 2012. She went by "Zaha," enjoying firstname-only celebrity brand name status, even beyond design circles. Brands and celebrities lined up to collaborate with Hadid: Chanel, Adidas (with Pharrell Williams), jewelers Swarovski and Georg Jensen, Moleskine, the German yacht makers Blohm+Voss, and of course the \$2,000 sculptural "haute couture" shoe designed with her friend and the Dutch theorist Rem Koolhaas. Long before today's "Lean In" movement, Hadid was a single, stylish, workaholic woman who ran a 400-person firm, and refused to shrink from controversy.

Hadid's reputation was built on drawing ideas ahead of their time. Her early architectural renderings, drawn in a distinctive style influenced by the Russian abstract art movement Suprematism, were usually technologically impossible to realize. "Hadid's work in the 1980s and early 1990s was startling," explains architecture critic Alexandra Lange to Quartz. "She hadn't built any of it yet-and it would be some time before she could-but her drawings were like a portal into another world." "She had the tenacity to stick to it until technology and public taste caught up to the idea that a building could look like it was always in motion," says Lange.

The Pritzker Prize, and a disdainful press

Hadid received her career-defining prize, the 2004 Pritzker, at the relatively young age of 53 despite only having a small body of built work. The accompanying headline of the official announcement-"Zaha Hadid Becomes the First Woman to Receive the Pritzker Architecture Prize"-signaled the tenor of the media coverage to follow.

Never mind the groundbreaking museum she designed in Cincinnati or the wonderfully weird fire station in Weil am Rhein, Germany or confounding design concepts, many profiles of the star architect fixated on her womanliness. A 2004 New Yorker profile introduced Hadid's work by way of her "remarkably emotive face, which veers from sweetly girlish to volcanically enraged." In a new book Where Are the Women Architects?, historian and architecture professor Despina Stratigakos argues this gendered portrayal of Hadid's person, and the kinds of questions she was often asked to answer, would have been unthinkable treatments for any of the previous 25 Pritzker laureates.

Cliches like "ball-breaking harridan" and "vertiginous heels," dot this 2004 article by The Guardian's Stuart Jeffries: Zaha Hadid offers a moist, limp hand to shake. She's coming down with flu. This is a disappointment. Where is the vibrant monster I'd been promised from previous interviews? Where's the ball-breaking harridan barking abuse in Arabic into her mobile as she wafts into her north-London studio in vertiginous heels, before snarling unpleasant things to her staff in terrifyingly idiomatic Anglo-Saxon?

The New York Times's influential critic Herbert Muschamp

seemed to turn up his nose at her rough-and-ready energy. "She is not someone you would talk to about books," Muschamp wrote. "Earthier appetites seem to drive her. I myself do not care greatly for lamb testicles. Should a sudden craving for this delicacy come over me, however, I would

know whom to call." The Financial Times's reporter Edwin Heathcote dared to ask Hadid if she even really deserved to win the Pritzker, architecture's highest honor. "I don't know how to answer that...some people must think I deserve it," she replied. Years later, with even more accolades and built projects under her belt, Hadid still refused to justify or qualify her achievements. At Oxford University just last month, a student similarly puzzled the architect by asking how she thought future architecture historians would appraise her work. "I really don't know," she said, after patiently listening to the long-winded question. She was just doing her thing, she would often say.

A role model, but never a mold

While there are many talented, recognized and respected female architects practicing around the world, Hadid was the only one to have so clearly punched a hole in that proverbial glass ceiling. For many rising female architects, losing Hadid is like seeing a beacon in the field extinguished. "Her loss is devastating," says Stratigakos, who also heads the architecture department at the University at Buffalo. "You lose heart when you can't find role models. I worry about how few women architects there are-not just in Pritzker prizes, but in novels, in films... I worry about my students."

According to a 2014 study by the San Francisco chapter of the American Institute of Architects, one-third of women drop out of the profession citing the lack of role models as a reason. Over 70% of women experience sexual discrimination, harassment or bullying on the job. But Hadid was a complicated figure, and not exactly the easiest role model. She was notorious for refusing to back down from criticism over her selection of clients or the working conditions of the people who built her designs. And her professional success was tightly intertwined with her force of personality and uniquely groundbreaking ideas-a formula few could hope to

As Hadid explained to the students in Oxford, she put ideas first-and often before practicality or the wishes of her clients. "I believe in progress, I think if we do enough research, we can push the envelope and get better results... That's what I like about architecture. It's exhilarating, but also heart-breaking." Two heartaches were the Cardiff Bay Opera House in Wales in 1994 and the ongoing saga of the Tokyo Olympics stadium in Japan. Both were politicized, high-profile commissions that seemed entranced by Hadid's ideas, then abruptly spurned her for another architect.

Proudly Arab and Iraqi

Hadid was also widely-revered in the Arab world, as one of few Arab women to have gained international celebrity status. "I first read about Zaha in the seventh grade," says Loubna Mrie, a Syrian colleague at Quartz. "We always used her as an example. Yes, smart, successful women exist. Look at Zaha, we would say." Born to an affluent family of Sunni Muslim Arabs in Baghdad, Hadid was educated in Catholic school, and studied mathematics at the American University in Beirut, Lebanon. She later studied at London's Architectural Association School of Architecture (AA), became a teacher, and established her practice there in 1980. She died a naturalized citizen of the UK.

From the very beginning of her career, Hadid stood out.

Of her time at the Architectural Association School, former classmate and architect Deborah Berke says: "She was a genius even then. Her talent was unmistakable." Hadid never forgot or dismissed her roots. In a revelatory 2014 interview with Lebanese journalist Ricardo Karam, Hadid said she disliked that journalists often confused her nationality and her citizenship. "It's always bothered me...I'm an Arab and an Iraqi," Hadid said. "I'm not Brit-English, I'm not half English, I

just live here [London]." An outsider in so many ways, Hadid burst into the greatest heights of architecture and stayed there, a vital proof to others that a woman-and an Arab woman-could do it. When, at the end of her lecture at Oxford, a young man asked for career advice, Hadid offered the only advice she could. "There is no real magic," she said. "It's really hard work.—
