### **BUDGET DEFICIT** AFTER 16 YEARS OF SURPLUSES

KUWAIT: Lower oil prices have pushed Kuwait into a rare budget deficit, ending 16 straight years of sur-pluses for the state, the finance minister said. The OPEC member recorded a budget shortfall of KD 4.6 billion (\$15.3 billion) in the fiscal year which ended on March 31, Anas Al-Saleh said in a statement car-ried by the KUNA news agency late Monday. It was

he by the Kunk news agency late wordings, it we the first shortfall since the fiscal year to March 1999. Revenues dropped by 45 percent to \$45.2 billion while spending was cut by 14.8 percent to \$60.5 billion, the minister said. Oil income was \$40.1 billion, a slump of 46.3 percent from the previous year, he said. Oil accounted for 89 percent of total revenues,

down from 95 percent in previous years.

Saleh told parliament last month that Kuwait plans to tap international debt markets through bond issues to finance the deficit. He said the state would borrow up to \$10 billion in US-denominated bonds from international markets, in both conventional and (Islamic) sukuk issuance. The ministry will borrow another \$6.6 billion in both conventional and Islamic instruments from the domestic market,

KUWAIT: The government yesterday agreed to consider demands by MPs to compensate Kuwaiti citizens after a hike in petrol prices due to take effect next month. This came during a meeting attended by HH the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah, four ministers and about 17 MPs to discuss ways to compensate citizens for the petrol hike. National Assembly Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanem said the meeting was positive and MPs insisted that the best solution to the problem is for the government to implement the study of the Assembly's financial and economic affairs committee, which calls for compensating citizens financially for the hike.

Ghanem said that the Assembly is insisting to implement the financial committee's study, which agrees to liberalize petrol prices but compensating citizens. He said the government and the Assembly agree on the main goals of the price hike but differ on the mechanisms, adding that the Assembly is prepared to face the economic situation but not at the cost of citizens. The speaker said that no time limit was given for the government to respond to the Assembly's proposals, but added that the Assembly will study the matter in the next term starting early October.

### FLAMBOYANT KUWAITI FENCER KNOCKED OUT IN EARLY LOSS

RIO DE JANEIRO: Kuwait's Abdulaziz Alshatti, the lone independent fencer in the Rio Olympics, was knocked out yesterday after an early loss. Kuwait's Olympic Committee was suspended by the IOC in 2015 for "undue government interfer-ence". Because of that the ban, Alshatti's only chance to earn a trip to Rio was a last-chance Asian qualifying event in April

in which only the winner advanced.

Alshatti took first in a stunning result. But he couldn't match that performance in Brazil. Alshatti had the backing of a small crowd that appeared to sympathize with his plight. But Hungary's Andras Redli survived a furious late rally from the hard-charging and flamboyant Kuwaiti, winning 14-13 in epee. — AP

### Leak but no fire at Ahmadi oilfield

KUWAIT: Kuwait Oil Company yesterday reported an oil leak during drilling at its Ahmadi oilfield, but a spokesman said there was no fire. Spokesman Emad Sultan said specialized teams were dealing with the spill.
"There was no fire as a result of the leak and we are still trying to bring it (the leak) under control," Sultan said. Kuwait is a major member of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC), pumping around 3 million barrels per day. Kuwait Oil Company said the leak at Ahmadi oilfield had no impact on output. The company said the spill struck at its BWD-133 drilling rig.

US approves \$1.15bn

military sales to Saudis
WASHINGTON: The US State Department has
approved the potential sale of more than 130
Abrams battle tanks, 20 armored recovery vehicles
and other equipment, worth about \$1.15 billion, to
Saudi Arabia, the Pentagon said yesterday. The US
Defense Security Cooperation Agency, which oversees foreign arms sales, said that General Dynamics
will be the principal contractor for the sale, adding sees foreign arms sales, said that General Dynamics will be the principal contractor for the sale, adding it would contribute to US national security by improving the security of a regional partner. "This sale will increase the Royal Saudi Land Force's (RSLF) interoperability with US forces and conveys US commitment to Saudi Arabia's security and armed forces modernization," the agency said. PARIS: France will supply 30 military helicopters to Kuwait in a deal worth over one billion euros (\$1.1 billion) that French Defence Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian signed yesterday. The agreement to buy the versatile Airbus Caracal helicopters is part of a €2.5 billion package of deals that the two countries agreed in Oct 2015. France has given Kuwait military support since the 1990 invasion of the country by Saddam Hussein's Iraqi forces. The two countries are also fighting together in the international coalition against the

Islamic State jihadist group.
"With this deal, Kuwait further strength-

ens the strategic partnership which has bound together our two countries for severa decades, while we are currently engaged side-by-side in the fight against Daesh in Iraq and Syria," Le Drian said in a statement, using the Arabic term for Islamic State. Kuwait's army will use 24 of the helicopters mainly for search and rescue missions and for transport purposes, but they are also fitted with machine guns allowing them to offer ground troops cover from the air. The Kuwait National Guard will operate the remaining six helicopters. Airbus confirmed the order in a statement. — Agencies

### PUTIN, ERDOGAN PLEDGE RESET AFTER RIFT

SAINT PETERSBURG: Russian President Vladimir Putin and Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday promised to reinvigorate ties after their first meeting since Ankara shot down a Russian warplane last November. Erdogan's visit to Putin's hometown of Saint Petersburg is also his first foreign trip since the failed coup against him last month that sparked a purge of opponents and cast a shadow over Turkey's relations with the West.

'We lived through a very complicated moment in the relations between our states and we very much want, and I feel our Turkish friends want, to overcome the difficulties. Putin told journalists at a joint press conference after the encounter. The Kremlin leader insisted it would take "painstaking work" and "some time" to return to previous trade levels as Russia looks to roll back a series of economic sanctions against Ankara, but both sides said they wanted to restart major energy projects hit by the crisis.

Erdogan said that he hoped Russian-Turkish relations would become "more robust" and stressed how important it was that Putin offered his support after the coup "We will bring our relations back to the old level and even beyond, both sides are determined and have the necessary will," he said. The shooting down of a Russian fighter jet by a Turkish F-16 over the Syrian border last fall saw a furious Putin slap economic sanctions on Turkey and launch a blistering war of words with Erdogan that seemed to irrevocably damage burgeoning ties.


But in a shock reversal late June, Putin accepted a letter expressing regret over the incident from Erdogan as an apology and quickly rolled back a ban on the sale of package holidays to Turkey and signaled Moscow would end measures against Turkish food imports and construction firms. Now in the wake of the failed July 15 coup attempt, there are fears in Western capitals that NATO-member Turkey

could draw even closer to Moscow - with Erdogan bluntly making it clear he feels let down by the United States and the European Union. Putin was one of the first foreign leaders to phone Erdogan offering support after the coup attempt and shares none of the scruples of EU leaders about the ensuing crackdown.

Relations between Turkey and Russia - two powers vying for influence in the strategic Black Sea region and Middle East - have historically not been straightforward. Yet before the plane downing crisis, Moscow and Ankara managed to prevent disputes on Syria and Ukraine harm ing strategic cooperation on issues like the TurkStream gas pipeline to Europe and a Russian-built nuclear power station in Turkey. Those projects were all put on ice with trade between the two countries falling 43 percent in January-May this year to \$6.1 billion and Turkey's tourism industry seeing visitor numbers from Russia fall by 93 percent



## SUFFICIENT AMOUNT OF NEW PASSPORTS AVAILABLE TO COVER DEMAND: OFFICIAL

### FAKE DOMESTIC HELP OFFICES BUSTED

**KUWAIT:** Interior Ministry's Assistant Undersecretary for Nationality and Passports Affairs Major General Sheikh Mazen Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah said the necessary amount of blank passports are now available to cover issuance or renewal of citizens' passports during the current and coming periods, and delays have ended for good.

He ordered, based on instructions by Deputy Premier and Interior Minister Sheikh Mohammad Al-Khaled Al-Sabah and follow up by Undersecretary Lieutenant General Suleiman Al-Fahd, to process transactions quickly and remove any obstacles, as employees are doing their best to hand over the passports as quickly

as possible. Sheikh Mazen appreciated the citizens' understanding of the delay in issuing pass-

said the department continues processing citizens' passports on a daily basis during official hours. Sheikh Mazen said all passports will be handed over at the start of next week and there will not be any pile up, adding that as for any new application, the passport will be ready within one week from the date of application. He asked citizens to renew their passports at the service centers, as this service has been resumed there as before.

### Fake offices

The Ministry of Interior's relations and security information said residency affairs detectives received tips about fake domestic help offices that carry out work through social media, and monitored several of them using these means and made agreements with those wanting domestic help. Six persons of various nationalities who are in violation of the residency law were arrested. One is a Bangladeshi, while the others include a South African, two Gambians and a Senegalese.

He said CAN organizes lectures by dermatologists at various government and private bodies as well as NGOs, because continued exposure to sunrays, especially at midday without precautions such as the use of sunscreen, hats and umbrellas may lead to sunburns and the possibility of skin cancer, in addition to ageing skin, wrinkles and spots.

Saleh said skin cancer in the most widespread because it can affect anyone and at any age, and among the risks of getting it is direct exposure to sunrays for a long time. Because this type of cancer is treatable if discovered early, awareness of the risks factors will reduce the number of cases, because Gulf countries have high temperatures and sunrays remain strong for a long time.

The Municipality has rejected the proposal of members of the municipal council with regards to allowing owners of investment real estate to open an office to manage their property by adding a commercial license for them, be it an establishment or company. It pointed to the conditions and specifications list for investment buildings, which says it is possible to have an office of the real estate owner on the upper floors of the building which will not be licensed commercially, and that it is allowed to have one office for all buildings.

Jahra municipality issued a warning to four mobile trailers that belong to hajj campaigns in the area between Andalus and Nahda at the start of the week because of a lack of valid licenses. Informed sources at the municipality said some of the campaigns violate laws and regulations and do not renew licenses for their temporary buildings. It said the deposit is KD 500 and will be returned if conditions in the contract are met.

## NO SUPPORT TO KUWAITI ATHLETES COMPETING UNDER OLYMPIC FLAG

PAS VOWS TO CONTINUE SPORTS REFORMS SOON

**KUWAIT:** The Public Authority for Sports (PAS) stated that it would work on a package of measures to continue sports reforms in the foreseeable future. In a press statement, the PAS said that the measures would focus on removing obstacles facing the Kuwaiti sports. It lauded the cabinet's statement on Monday which called for continuing reforms of the sports sector to defend Kuwait's standing in international sports events.

PAS voiced its respect of the Olympic Charter which allows qualified athletes to compete as Independent Olympic Athletes (IOA) under the Olympic flag, but it would offer no support to any athlete who partakes in international sports events under any flag other than the national one.

It, however, expressed discontent over the absence of Kuwaiti athletes from the currently held Rio Olympic Games due to the International Olympic Committee's



decision to ban Kuwait participation in international events. It emphasized the fairness of the Kuwaiti sports cause and the right of Kuwaiti athlete to play under the flag of their country. PAS vowed to do all in power to overcome challenges and develop Kuwaiti sports movement. — KUNA

# OPERATIONAL RISK SIGNIFICANT THREAT FACING ANY FINANCIAL BODY: GOVERNOR

Proactive role needed to assure cyber resiliency in banking systems

**KUWAIT:** Governor of the Central Bank of Kuwait Dr Mohammad Al-Hashel said yesterday that operational risk is one of the most significant risks faced by any financial institution, as evidenced by the major losses of the financial services industry experienced over the past few decades which were prompted by a series of operational failures.

The current risk profile of financial institutions is shaped not only by the recent global financial crises and the effect it has had on regulatory practices, but also by the various operational mishaps that have occurred resulting from initial flaws in a world of rapidly developing technology, the Governor said in an editorial published by the 'International Financial Law Review (IFLR) Euromoney plc' dubbed "IFLR Global Operational Risk Review 2016."

He went on to say that operational risk definitions as they apply specifically to cyber risk need to be continually updated by the Basel Committee for Banking Supervision to take account of the dynamics and ever-increasing complexity of interconnected global markets.

### **Cyber threats**

For financial institutions, the risk of cyber threats disrupting core operations is a matter of grave concern, he added, pointing out that financial institutions maintain massive amounts of data which, in turn, require support in the form of complex technology which in certain circumstances may provide an easy target for cyber-attacks aimed at defrauding, theft, etc.

Additionally, the practice of outsourcing operations for the development of computer and communications technology within pay-

ment systems and the banking sector has in some cases meant that their development has been at a faster pace than the regulatory framework in which they operate, he said, adding that as these systems evolve quickly with the use of new technologies, cyber security emerges as a potentially serious operational risk.

"We, as regulators, cannot afford to have trust in our banking institutions and payments systems lost, and the potential disruption caused to the financial system as a result of cyber-attacks should receive significant attention - in line with that of confronting other issues that may threaten financial stability". "Therefore, we need to

focus on how best to address and secure potential risks of this nature and play an active role in protecting the safety, security and efficiency of the financial system as a whole", he clarified.

### **Proactive role**

Regulators need to focus on how best to address this emerging risk and play a proactive role in assuring cyber resiliency in banking and payment systems. Given the importance of making payments available to enable smooth functioning of an economy, investment in technology to ensure a cyber-resilient and risk-less security system must become a national priority, focused on timely detection, limiting destruction as well as rapid remediation of damaged resources, the Governor said.

He noted that considering the evolving nature of cyber threats, a financial institution's response must be on an ongoing basis in order to adopt an institution-wide approach to cyber security that goes beyond just the IT Department.

Regardless of future regulations and government actions on cyber security, financial institutions should be working constantly to establish a governance framework for cyber risk that engages the Board of Directors as well as management. Furthermore, timely exchange of intelligence on such matters between peer institutions, regulators, and law enforcement agencies becomes essential in assuring that there is an appropriate global policy response to address this problem.

Irrespective of location cyber threats have no borders - and neither the geography nor the size of an institution make it immune to this type of risk, he concluded. — KUNA

# ALL APARTMENTS MUST HAVE WATER METERS: MINISTRY

**KUWAIT:** The Ministry of Electricity and Water (MEW) has decided that every apartment in Kuwait must have its own water meter to avoid problems that lead to cuts because of disputes between the building's owner and residents. Sources said this comes after a comprehensive study, and will make the consumers pay for the amount of water they use. This will also pave the way for MEW to install smart meters at a later stage, this providing an easier way for the ministry to charge consumers under new tariffs. MEW had already announced placing a tender to install smart meters for electricity at apartment buildings.

Last April, the parliament passed a bill allowing the government to hike electricity and water

charges for expatriates after completely excluding Kuwaiti citizens. The application of the new charges will not take effect before September 2017.

According to the law, the hike in electricity and water tariffs applies to apartment buildings (expatriates only), the commercial sector, industrial and agricultural sectors and government offices. It applies after one year on commercial activities which will be charged a flat rate of 25 fils per kilowatt. On government offices, it applies after 18 months and after 21 months on industrial and agricultural activities.

The new charges will be hiked for expatriates from the current 2 fils per kilowatt to the following:

1- Five fils per kilowatt for the first 1,000 kilowatts. 2- 10 fils per kilowatt for between 1,000 and

3- 15 fils per kilowatt for consumption above 2,000 kW.

The consumption is calculated on a monthly basis. Current average monthly charges for a medium-size apartment is around KD 5-7. But under the new charges, the monthly bill in summer months, when air-conditioning does not stop, could easily hit above KD 50 depending on consumption. In summer months (May-September) the monthly consumption of medium-sized apartments is roughly around 3,000 kW. This means the bill will be KD 30. If consumption rises to 4,000 kW, the bill will be KD 45 and so on. In winter months, the rate will remain around KD 5 or slightly above that, also depending on consumption.

KUWAIT: Kuwait Finance House (KFH) held a comprehensive training program for 21 new female recruits in an attempt to improve their proficiency in banking transactions and financial services to better serve clients and cater for their aspirations at KFH's ladies branches.

The one-month program encompassed training courses and workshops on banking products, such as; banking cards, bank accounts, deposits, letters of guarantee, and KFH eservices. In addition, the program tackled training courses on sharia basics, counterfeiting and fraud, GFS Ethix, not to mention the call center; its equipment, role, and the services it renders.

Moreover, the program witnessed presentations of the female recruits who demonstrated their proposals of developing a service or a product.

These proposals undergo assessments and review by members of high level panel of KFH mangers and chiefs.

### KFAED PROVIDES KD 15 MILLION LOAN TO MALDIVES

**KUWAIT:** Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) has announced that it signed a loan agreement with the Maldives, worth KD 15 million (\$51 million), to finance the project of expanding and improving Ibrahim Nasser International Airport there.

The project aims to support social and economic development in the Maldives based on promoting tourism through the expansion and development of the airport's terminals, the fund said in a press statement yesterday. By this move, the airport is expected to receive up to 7.3 million passengers annually, it added.

The Maldives' Finance and Treasury Minister Ahmad Munawar and KFAED's Deputy Director General Hesham Al-Woqaian signed the loan agreement. It is the 12th loan provided to the Maldives, estimated at KD 24.5 million, to finance different projects. The fund also offered 8 technical aid estimated at KD 1.39 million for feasibility studies of some projects, in addition to a grant of \$two million by the State of Kuwait to buttress efforts aiming to maintain food security in the Muslim countries. — KUNA

### **Environment police**



### **COEXISTING WITH CORRUPTION**

about the economic reconciliation and investment law, which will be among the priorities of the parliament during the delicate circumstances the first Arab Spring country is going through. The proposal came with an initiative from the presidency in July 2015, and its opponents quickly said that it is a reconciliation with the symbols of corruption, men who contributed to looting the country's wealth during the former regime which the revolution erupted against, and that accountability must come first, then reconciliation. An activist said, "we are for reconciliation, but we are against all what may equate normalization with corruption."

Meanwhile, supporters of the project believed it will push the deteriorating economy forward, and contribute to rescuing the financial and developmental situation, and that reconciliation is a strategic option to boost national unity. It seems that all scenarios will remain open if the proposal is passed or struck down. It was notable that the Tunisian Judges Association called for its withdrawal due to its "violation of the constitution, requirements of transitional justice and legal defects", and considered that "it creates a forgiving precedence related to crimes of financial corruption and violation of public funds". The judges association went so far as to say that the proposal "does not encourage nor motivate strengthening of the judicial role in deterring such crimes".

proposal, it means there are serious fears from the results of its approval and implementation. Even in Egypt, there is a heated debate with regards to reconciliation with businessmen. Opponents of the reconciliation believe that there are suspicions of corruption and violations of public funds, but opposition there was not strong and heated as the case is in Tunisia, and most judges did not reject this reconciliation proposal. It seems there are fears in Tunisia that some remaining symbols from Zine El Abidine Ben Ali's regime may benefit from the practices, intentions and legislations that leaders of the current stage are overlooking.

There are multiple differences between parties and powers participating in the Tunisian authority, while matters in Egypt took a different turn after President Abdelfattah Al-Sisi was able to grasp most powers, meaning that there is a lot of confusion and lack of opposition to many decisions of economic, financial and developmental nature. But the mega projects Sisi promised to launch like the Suez Canal and others "changed" the attention to this issue.

Generally, fighting corruption in the Arab Spring countries was among the most important goals of the revolutions, and if this page is turned without accountability and bearing responsibility, then it will be a disappointment for the masses and rejection of the youth sacrifices. This forgiveness and lack of accountability will lead to a repeat of the corruption phenomenon in all its shapes, because of the lack of a deterrent.

**GUWAHATI:** An Indian rights activist who has waged what is thought to be the world's longest hunger strike ended her 16-year fast yesterday after vowing to continue her struggle by standing for election in her home state. Irom Sharmila, dubbed the "Iron Lady of Manipur" for her unwavering protest against alleged rights abuses by security forces in the insurgency-hit northeast Indian state, was released on bail after she promised a court she would end her fast. The 44-year-old had been held in judicial custody on

charges of attempting suicide-still a criminal offence in India-and confined to a hospital where she was force-fed through a nasal tube. Speaking to journalists outside the court in the Manipur capital Imphal, she said her long campaign had not worked. "I went on a fast for about 16 years thinking I could change the system, but I now realise that

this will not yield any result.

"So I decided to end my fast and join politics and then fight for the cause that I undertook this mission for justice," she told journalists, speaking in her native Metei language. Irom is campaigning for the repeal of the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), which covers large parts of the northeast and the restive state of Kashmir. It gives Indian forces sweeping powers to search, enter property and shoot on sight, and has been criticized as a cover for human rights abuses. The Indian government says security forces need the powers to help them battle multiple rebel groups whose long-standing demands range from secession to greater autonomy and land rights.

### Who is Irom Sharmila?

The 44-year-old poet and activist was born in a small vil lage in the remote and insurgency-wracked northeast Indian state of Manipur. She belongs to the Meitei ethnic group who dominate Manipur. She began fasting in 2000 after allegedly witnessing the army kill 10 people at a bus stop near her home. She has been held in judicial custody almost ever since, and has spent much of the last 16 years confined to a hospital ward.

### What is hunger strike about?

She is campaigning for the repeal of the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) in Manipur, a remote and impoverished Indian state that is home to a number of sep aratist insurgent groups. The controversial act allows India's security forces to shoot on sight and arrest anybody without a warrant and is in force in Indian-administered Kashmir and across much of the northeast. Last month the Supreme Court ordered an investigation into the use of "excessive and retaliatory" force by police and the military in Manipur.

How has she been kept alive? She has been force-fed via a nasal drip in hospital. Images taken when she emerges from hospital to make one of her frequent court appearances in Manipur show her looking emaciated and frail, with plastic tubes taped to her nose. —AFP

GUWAHATI: The former chief minister of a remote Indian region disputed with China was found dead and hanging from a ceiling fan yesterday, police and officials said, after a court ruled last month that his appointment had been illegal. The Supreme Court ruling dealt a blow to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's ambitions of expanding in the northeast, where his Bharatiya Janata Party scored its first state election victory in the region with a win in

Assam in May.

Kalikho Pul, 47, until July the chief minister of the north-eastern state of Arunachal Pradesh, had suffered from depression and was upset over the judgment, his aides told media. "He has committed suicide," Nabam Tuki, a senior lawmaker of the opposition Congress party said in the capirawmaker of the opposition Congress party said in the capital of the vast but sparsely populated region bordering China. Pul's family discovered the body in his bedroom at the chief minister's residence. Media said he had left a diary, which police were examining. A politician with Congress since 1995, Pul became chief minister in February after

rebelling against the party.
He was put in charge by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's federal government, which had imposed direct rule in the state to end a political crisis. But the Supreme Court held illegal the imposition of president's rule, as it is called in India, ordering that the dislodged Congress should return to power immediately, forcing Pul from office. China claims more than 90,000 sq km (35,000 sq miles) of territory dis-puted by India in the eastern sector of the Himalayas. Much of that forms the Indian state of Arunachal Pradesh, which China calls South Tibet, India says China occupies 38,000 square km (14,600 sq miles) of its territory on the Aksai Chin plateau in the west. — Reuters

# UN GAZA EMPLOYEE ACCUSED OF 'AIDING HAMAS'

JERUSALEM: Israel said yesterday it had arrested and charged a United Nations employee for allegedly aiding Islamist movement Hamas, in the second such case involving a humanitarian worker in a week. Engineer Waheed Borsh, who has worked for the UN Development Program (UNDP) since 2003, was arrested on July 16 and indicted in a civilian court in Israel yesterday, a government statement said.

Hamas, which has run the Gaza Strip since 2007, denied the allegations. The statement said 38-year-old Borsh, from Jabaliya in northern Gaza, had been recruited by "a senior member of the Hamas terrorist organization to redirect his work for UNDP to serve Hamas' military interests". It said he had confessed to a number of charges, including helping to build a jetty in the northern Gaza Strip, with UNDP funding, that was later used by Hamas' naval forces.

In 2015 he allegedly persuaded managers to focus on rebuilding houses in areas where Hamas members lived, after the group put pressure on him. No figures

were provided on how much aid money he is alleged to have diverted. Hamas said in a statement that the allegations were "incorrect and baseless". It said they were part of a wider Israeli effort "to tighten the siege of the Gaza Strip by prosecuting international relief organizations." The Israeli government said that Borsh admitted during the investigation that "other Palestinians who work for aid organizations are also working for Hamas".

### 'Systematic exploitation'

"This is not an isolated case, but rather a troubling trend of the systematic exploitation by Hamas terrorists of UN organizations," the Israeli ambassador to the UN, Danny Danon, said in a separate statement. The formal charge sheet was not publicly available. UNDP said that it would respond to the allegations soon. It comes days after the Gaza head of US-based NGO World Vision was charged with passing millions of dollars of international aid money to Hamas.

According to the Shin Bet internal security agency, Mohammed Al-Halabi diverted

\$7.2 million (6.5 million euros) each year since 2010 to Hamas and its military wing, though his charge sheet does not specify an amount. Halabi is also accused of recruiting an individual from another international NGO, Save the Children, to Hamas. World Vision International yesterday questioned the allegations, suggesting the numbers may have been exaggerated.

Its president Kevin Jenkins said in a statement the organization was conducting an investigation into the allegations but "have not seen any of the evidence". "World Vision's cumulative operating budget in Gaza for the past ten years was approximately \$22.5 million, which makes the alleged amount of up to \$50 million being diverted hard to reconcile," the statement read. Since 2008, Israel has fought three wars in Gaza with Hamas, which is branded a terrorist organization by Israel, the United States and the European Union. More than three quarters of the population of the Strip, which Israel has blockaded for a decade, are reliant on some form of aid, according to the United Nations. — AFP

# RUSSIA-TURKEY FEUD: FROM JET DOWNING TO MAKING UP

MOSCOW: Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin yesterday hold their first meeting since the two leaders began healing a bitter feud over Ankara's downing of a Russian warplane. Here is a timeline of the crisis that slammed the brakes on burgeoning ties between the two strategically important nations and set Erdogan and Putin against each other:

### Russian jet downed

A Turkish military jet blasts a Russian warplane out of the sky over the Turkey-Syria border on November 24, 2015. One pilot is killed, reportedly shot dead by rebel fighters as he parachutes to earth inside Syria. A Russian soldier dies in a successful rescue operation to rescue the second pilot. NATO-member Turkey insists the Russian plane-part of Moscow's bombing campaign to back up Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad-was one of two jets that had strayed into Turkish airspace for some 17 seconds despite repeated warnings. Moscow is adamant that its aircraft did not cross the Syrian border and a furious Putin labels the incident a "stab in the back" by "the accomplices of terrorists".

### Russia strikes back

Moscow fires back by announcing a raft of economic sanctions against Ankara on November 28, including banning a range of Turkish food imports and halting the sale of package holidays and charter flights to the country. The retaliatory measures target Turkey's key tourism, agricultural and construction sectors and send growing trade between the two nations plummeting. Talks on the major TurkStream gas pipeline project are also suspended and work on a Russian-built nuclear plant in Turkey thrown into doubt.

### War of words

Meanwhile the war of words between Putin and Erdogan-two strongmen whose macho leadership styles have helped bring them together-rages on as Moscow demands Ankara apologize. Russia accuses Erdogan of profiting from the illegal oil trade with Islamic State jihadists, claims the Turkish leader slams as "slander". Putin snubs an offer from Erdogan to meet during climate talks in Paris after refusing to take his calls, and cancels a summit in December.

### **Erdogan writes to Putin**

After seven months of feuding Erdogan sends Putin a letter on June 27 in which he expresses his condolences over the jet downing and calls for a return to friendlier ties. The Kremlin says the message constitutes an apology and the two leaders two days later hold their first phone conversation since the start of the crisis. Turkish newspaper Hurriyet has reported that the letter was published after both sides secretly agreed to restore ties and hammered out the wording following mediation by figures including Kazakh President Nursultan Nazarbayev and a prominent Turkish businessman.

### Putin starts to lift sanctions

After talking to Erdogan, Putin-whose country's own economy is mired in recession due to Western sanctions over Ukraine and low oil prices-immediately announces an end to the package tour ban and orders his ministers to begin lifting the charter flight freeze and normalizing trade ties with Ankara. The move brings relief to Turkey's hard-hit tourism industry that has seen the number of Russian visitors nosedive dramatically.

### Coup call

In a sign that ties are warming, Putin is one of the first international leaders to call Erdogan and offer his support after the failed coup against the Turkish president on July 15. Ankara welcomes the Kremlin leader's backing as the fallout from the coup attempt sees Erdogan launch a purge of opponents that strains ties with the West. — AFP

# THAILAND'S JUNTA UNEASY ABOUT POKEMON GO CRAZE

**BANGKOK:** Pokemon Go's debut in Thailand has alarmed the country's generals, prompting the kingdom's junta chief to warn youngsters against playing too much and the army to ban the game from barracks. The mobile app was made available in Thailand on Saturday, delighting many in a country where Japanese subcultures have a significant following.

But the game-which encourages users to hit the pavements in search of digital monsters-has sparked safety concerns partly because Bangkok's streets are notoriously pedestrian-unfriendly. "Thai walking culture is not like Japan and there are limited pavements," government spokesman Sansern Kaewkumnerd told reporters yesterday. He said Prime Minister Prayut Chan-O-Cha, who seized power in 2014, "does not want to ban the game".

But the premier has urged players to know "their limits... and use their time wisely," Sansern added. "The game could harm players with things like loss of money, their job, their education as well as the relationships they have with the people around them," he said. He added that parents should advise their children to be "self-disciplined" and use their time well. His comments came as Deputy Prime Minister Prawit Wongsuwan

said the game was banned inside military barracks and government security agencies.

A barracks in the northern city of Khon Kaen hoisted a sign warning Pokemon Go players they faced up to three years in jail if they trespassed onto military property, Channel 3 television showed. Even when a pedestrian's eyes are firmly fixed ahead Bangkok's streets can be a veritable obstacle course. Pavements are patchy and those that exist are littered with hurdles from street vendors and fire hydrants to potholes and tangled wiring. Thailand's Public Health Ministry said the game should be welcomed for encouraging people to exercise but warned users to be careful near "roads, swimming pools, rivers and canals".

Local media has been filled in recent days with stories of hundreds of players glued to their phones outside parks and malls. Some have even taken to using motorbike taxis and cars to get a head start as they navigate the traffic-choked city in their search for Pokemon. Giorgio Taraschi, an Italian living in Bangkok, said he was lightly struck on Monday night by a man driving a car while playing the game. "Gotta catch 'em all... including the occasional Italian," he joked on Facebook, using the game's tagline. — AFP

# TURKEY SAYS RISING ANTI-AMERICANISM CAN BE CALMED BY GULEN EXTRADITION

## 16,000 PEOPLE FORMALLY ARRESTED OVER COUP ATTEMPT

ISTANBUL: Anti-American sentiment among Turks is on the rise and can only be calmed by the United States extraditing the Muslim cleric Ankara accuses of orchestrating last month's failed coup, Turkey's justice minister said yesterday. Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan blames Fethullah Gulen, who has lived in self-imposed exile in rural Pennsylvania since 1999, and his followers for the July 15 coup, in which more than 240 people were killed and nearly 2,200 wounded.

Turkey has launched a series of mass purges of suspected Gulen supporters in its armed forces, other state institutions, universities, schools and the media since the abortive coup, prompting Western concerns for the stability of a key NATO ally. Erdogan, who was visiting Russia yesterday, has criticized the United States and the European Union for showing what he says is a lack of solidarity with Turkey over the coup and of caring more for the rights of people he views as traitors.

"There is a serious anti-American feeling in Turkey, and this is turning into hatred," Justice Minister Bekir Bozdag said in an interview with state-run Anadolu Agency, broadcast live on Turkish television channels. "It is in the hands of the United States to stop this anti-American feeling leading to hatred." Responding to Turkey's demand for Gulen's extradition, US President Barack Obama has said Ankara must first provide clear evidence of wrongdoing.

Last week a State Department spokesman said Washington was evaluating new documents it had received. The 75-year-old Gulen, who built up a network of schools, charities and businesses in Turkey and abroad over decades, denies any involvement in the coup and has condemned it. He has also accused Erdogan of using the coup to amass greater powers.

### 'Political decision'

"Whether the US extradites Gulen or not this will be a political decision," Bozdag said. "If he is not extradited, Turkey will have been sacrificed for a terrorist." A recent opinion poll showed two thirds of Turks agree with their president that Gulen was behind the coup plot. Turkey has been holding almost daily mass rallies since July 15 in support of democracy and the government and against the plotters. Authorities have suspended, detained or put under investigation tens of thousands of people in the armed forces, the judiciary, civil service and elsewhere since the coup, in which a faction of the military commandeered warplanes, helicopters and tanks in an attempt to topple the government.

Yesterday Bozdag put the number of people now formally arrested awaiting trial at 16,000, adding that a further 6,000 detainees were still being processed. Another 7,668 people are under investigation but have not been detained, he said. Since the abortive putsch, pro-government papers have been awash with conspiracy theories accusing the United States and the CIA of being

the masterminds. Turkish officials privately said such reports do not reflect Ankara's formal stance.

One paper said the attempted power grab was financed by the CIA and directed by a retired US army general using a cell in Afghanistan while another claims CIA agents used an island hotel off Istanbul as a nerve center for the plot. Echoing Erdogan's criticism of the West, Prime Minister Binali Yildirim on Tuesday repeated a pledge to bring Gulen back to Turkey. "That terrorist leader will come to Turkey and pay for what he did. We will hold him accountable for the blood of our martyrs and veterans," Yildirim told a meeting of his ruling Islamist-rooted AK Party in parliament. "That religious, impudent, lying, bloody murdering nothing will be surely held accountable."

NATO member Turkey hosts American troops and warplanes at its Incirlik Air Base, an important staging area for the US-led fight against Islamic State militants in neighboring Iraq and Syria. The chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff Joseph Dunford tried to soothe strained ties with Turkey during a visit to Incirlik and Ankara just over a week ago. In Ankara he inspected the damage inflicted by the plotters' fighter jets on

the Turkish parliament building.
US Secretary of State John Ke

US Secretary of State John Kerry is expected to visit Turkey on Aug 24. Turkish authorities have said the country's intelligence service has cracked into several smartphone messaging apps that Gulen's followers used to communicate with each other in the years ahead of the coup attempt and was able to trace tens of thousands of people from the group. A senior Turkish official said Turkey's intelligence agency has identified at least 56,000 operatives of Gulen's network after cracked a little-known smartphone messaging app called ByLock, which he said the group began using in 2014. By this year, Turkish intelligence were able to map their network.

"Our assessment is that 150,000 unique operatives used ByLock to communicate with others," the official said. The group had also used another app called Eagle which could be disguised as other popular instant messaging apps such as Whatsapp and Tango, he added. "We assess that Eagle was used by operatives to share various operational details as well as during the planning stage of the July 15 coup attempt," the official said, adding that the Gulen network continued to use Eagle. — Reuters

## FEARS MOUNT FOR CIVILIANS; BATTLE FOR ALEPPO LOOMS

**BEIRUT:** The United Nations has called for urgent aid access to Syria's Aleppo as regime forces and rebel fighters prepare for an all-out battle for control of the devastated city. Fears are growing for trapped civilians ahead of what is expected to be a major battle for Aleppo, Syria's second city and a focal point of the country's five-year civil war. Rebel factions and President Bashar Al-Assad's regime have sent hundreds of reinforcements to Aleppo in anticipation of the fighting, after opposition forces broke a government siege at the weekend and vowed to capture the entire city. Hundreds of thousands of civilians remain inside the city, once Syria's main economic hub, and UN officials have sounded the alarm over trapped residents.

The UN's top humanitarian official in Syria, Yacoub El Hillo, and regional coordinator Kevin Kennedy said in a statement late on Monday that medical and food stocks "are running dangerously low" in Aleppo.

They appealed for a full-fledged ceasefire or weekly 48-hour "humanitarian pauses" to reach those in need. UNICEF said children and families in Aleppo were facing "a catastrophic situation", with up to two million people without running water for four days after fighting damaged electricity networks needed to pump supplies. "These cuts are coming amid a heatwave, putting children at a grave risk of waterborne dis-

eases," Hanaa Singer, UNICEF's representative in Syria, said in a statement.

### 'Children in serious danger'

"Getting clean water running again cannot wait for the fighting to stop. Children's lives are in serious danger." Aleppo has been divided between a rebel-held east and regime-controlled west since fighting erupted in the city in mid-2012. The UN says two million people in the city are at risk, including up to 275,000 people in east Aleppo. Other estimates put the total number of civilians in the city at about 1.5 million, with 250,000 in the eastern districts. The recent flare-up in fighting began in late June as government forces closed in on the Castello Road, the last route into rebel-held parts of the city. The road was severed in mid-July, beginning a roughly three-week siege of eastern districts until opposition fighters broke through regime

territory on Saturday.

The push saw a coalition of rebels, Islamists, and jihadists cut off the regime's own main access road on the southern edges of the city. The offensives have left residents across the city reeling from skyrocketing prices and food shortages and afraid of further violence. Each side has used newly acquired territory to bring food and other supplies into neighborhoods they control, but the roads are still not safe for civilians to use. — AFP

# CRISTINA AND CO: LATIN FIRST LADIES AND PRESIDENTS

BUENOS AIRES: Like "Evita" before her, Cristina Kirchner stepped from her husband's shadow to make a mark on Argentine politics one of several powerful women in the macho Latin American political world. "I am not Evita, nor Hillary" Clinton, Kirchner, who is widely known just as "Cristina," once said. She spoke when she was a senator and first lady of Argentina ahead of the 2007 presidential election that brought her to office as the successor to her husband, Nestor.

In one sense she was right. Kirchner, 63, has been arguably more divisive than either the erstwhile Argentina leftist heroine or even Bill Clinton's wife, now running for US president. "I have some things in common with Hillary. We have both been senators, lawyers and wives of presidents, but not much more," Kirchner said. "I don't want to be compared to Hillary or Evita or anyone. The best thing you can be is yourself." Kirchner says she has contended with a sexist political culture and media who often belittled her political decisions as bouts of womanly "hysteria."

After being elected to succeed her husband, Kirchner pushed on with his left-wing social policies. "He always told me that people would demand much more of me" than of him when he was elected in 2003 in the wake

of a financial crisis, she said in a televised interview last week. "We were in such a bad state in 2003 that they never demanded things of him that they later demanded of my government," she said. Like other Latin American leftist leaders, for her supporters Kirchner was a heroine of the poor. But to her rivals, she was an irresponsible populist. "In my case there was another aspect, the feminine aspect," she said. "That weighed heavily in Argentina, where in some areas there is still misogyny about women in power."

### Dilma

"Cristina says that after so many decades as a deputy and a senator, she got used to fighting to be listened to in places where it was hard to be heard," said Sandra Russo, author of an official biography of Kirchner, published in 2011. "She has a very high mental threshold." Kirchner compared her treatment in the media with another recent Latin American female leftist head of state. Dilma Rousseff of Brazil. On the front page of a magazine, Kirchner said, "they portrayed me as hysterical and crazy. They did the same with Dilma. We are both women." Like Kirchner, Rousseff has succumbed to scandal. She has been suspended from office to face an impeachment trial over

alleged financial irregularities in what she has called a "coup" by her rivals. In Argentina, meanwhile, the courts are also going after Kirchner over alleged corruption, in what she has branded a politically motivated campaign. Her conservative successor, Mauricio Macri, is busy unwinding her social welfare policies and protectionist trade measures.

### Rosario

Latin America has seen 10 women presidents in the past four decades. Among them, socialist Michelle Bachelet is serving her second term as president of Chile. In Peru, Keiko Fujimori narrowly lost a presidential election in June. She served as first lady during the leadership of her now-jailed father Alberto Fujimori. In Nicaragua, President Daniel Ortega, 70, this week put his wife, Rosario Murillo, down as his vice-presidential running mate as he runs for re-election in a November 6 vote. Murillo, 65, is currently a government minister and the main spokesperson for Ortega's leftist administration. Many see her as the real power in the country over the past decade. She is a mother of 10 and a well-known poet in her country. Ortega is widely expected to win a third consecutive term from 2017 to 2022, given the fragmented opposition. —AFP

# US AIR STRIKES SHOW LIMITS ON THE LIBYA INTERVENTION

### WEST RISKS BEING SEEN TO TAKE SIDES BETWEEN FACTIONS

**TUNIS:** While US jets and drones are pounding Islamic State in the Libyan city of Sirte, Western powers are unlikely to expand their military involvement rapidly, anxious to avoid exacerbating factional divisions as the government they support struggles to establish itself. The United Nationsbacked government asked for the US air strikes which began on Aug 1, but it has still not made a long-awaited request for broader security help including a possible easing of an international arms embargo on the factions which emerged during and after the 2011 overthrow of Muammar Gaddafi.

"They know that the international community is ready to help with trainpeacekeeping mission has fizzled out, and foreign ground intervention has been limited to small-scale special forces deployments.

Coastguard training is being planned, but programs to train and equip national security and police forces have yet to be developed. One request that is expected sooner or later is for exemptions to the UN arms embargo. World powers said in May they were ready to consider this to help the GNA combat Islamic State, but much depends on its ability to show that arms will not end up in the wrong hands, from a Western point of view. Among the likely recipients would be fighters from the city of Misrata, which

ing and advice, but specific requests are not emerging yet," said a Western diplomatic source. Forces aligned to the Government of National Accord (GNA), which set up in Tripoli four months ago, have battled for weeks to remove Islamic State fighters from Sirte, the jihadist group's former North African stronghold.

Now US "Operation Odyssey Lightning" is targeting tanks, armed pick-up trucks and fighting positions in the slowly shrinking area of Sirte that Islamic State still holds, easing the passage for Libyan ground forces. However, the GNA has moved slowly to formulate its own security strategy and seek more foreign help, handicapped by internal political splits, a lack of capacity, and sensitivity to criticism that it is dependent on external support, Libyan and Western officials say. Discussion of a 5,000-strong Italian-led

lies roughly midway between Tripoli

They have backed the GNA, providing security in Tripoli and leading the battle against Islamic State in Sirte, Gaddafi's home town. However, the loyalty of Libya's armed factions has been fickle in the past and the GNA's leadership, or Presidential Council, has yet to form a unified military command structure. "Only regular units under the command of the Presidential Council will get an exemption from the arms embargo," UN Libya envoy Martin Kobler said. "The Presidential Council has to be accepted as the Supreme Commander of the army. The question is does it really have control over the Misrata forces? Maybe yes, maybe no."

### **Loud rejection**

The Misrata brigades say they will return home after securing Sirte from Islamic State, also known as ISIS. However, some people see a risk of renewed conflict between loose alliances of armed groups that fought for control of Tripoli in 2014. The fear is that the Misrata brigades will end up fighting forces loyal to Khalifa Haftar, a military commander based in eastern Libya.

Haftar and his allies have so far loudly rejected the GNA, and foreign owers intervening anywhere in Libya risk being seen to take sides among the local factions. "The challenge for the West will always be to surgically fight ISIS whenever that implies not getting dragged into Libya's civil war," said Mattia Toaldo, a Libya expert at the European Council on Foreign Relations. The limited foreign involvement so far has met with a mixed reception locally. While the United States and Britain are popular around Misrata, France is out of favor there. French Special Forces have been operating for months in the eastern city of Benghazi, where fighters loyal to Haftar have been battling opponents including Islamic State.

After three French soldiers were killed last month in a helicopter crash south of Benghazi, confirming their presence, there were protests in Misrata and Tripoli, and the GNA summoned the French ambassador. However, the US strikes against Islamic State - both in Sirte and in the western city of Sabratha in February have provoked few protests. Libyan militants returning from fighting in the Syrian civil war helped to implant Islamic State in the country in 2014, but the group has struggled to win support or hold territory, with most local people regarding it as a malign import dependent on foreign fighters.

The GNA-backed forces wonder why the US strikes did not come sooner. "We just want this fight to end, we'll take any help we can get," said one commander on the Sirte front line. But that openness does not extend to the idea of foreign boots on the ground, or broader efforts to end the security vacuum that allowed Islamic State to gain a foothold. "The need for outside help with training is certainly recognized at senior political level," the diplomat said. But in discussions about a peacekeeping force, the Libyan position was very clear nothing like the 'Green Zone', the secure international area of Baghdad, would be acceptable. Even for training, "any visible presence on the streets would be difficult", said the diplomat. —Reuters

# NO END IN SIGHT AS ANTI-IS CAMPAIGN ENTERS 3RD YEAR

**WASHINGTON:** The US-led military effort against the Islamic State group started exactly two years ago, aimed at halting the jihadists as they swept across Iraq, leaving a trail of human butchery and destruction in their wake. It was supposed to have been a swift and narrow campaign that would help local forces deal a "lasting defeat" to IS jihadists. But billions of dollars and more than 14,000 air strikes later, such assertions are buckling, and the campaign highlights the limits of fighting a war mainly from the skies. "I think we are looking at decades of effort," said Charles Lister, a senior fellow at the Middle East Institute. "We are fighting a losing battle if we expect to

completely destroy (IS) altogether." Nearly half of the territory once held by the IS group in Iraq has been liberated, as well as about 20 percent of its claim in neighboring Syria. Experts foresee the eventual collapse of the group's self-declared "caliphate," but the jihadists are fighting back by calling on followers to launch attacks across the globe. Just this year, IS has claimed a string of horrific attacks including in France, Belgium, Turkey, Baghdad and the United States. "This is an organization that has very successfully morphed back into a traditional terrorist organization that then steadily rebuilds its capabilities," Lister said.

### US boots on the ground

When President Barack Obama launched air strikes in Iraq in August 2014, officials stressed US involvement would not be sustained for the long term. And Obama, elected on a promise of ending America's wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, vowed ground troops would not be dragged back into another conflict. He has repeatedly insisted that while the United States can provide support and air strikes, the war has to be won by local forces-not Americans.

Still, about 6,500 coalition troopsmostly American-have deployed in the anti-IS fight. Most are in Irag, though some special operations forces are working with Kurdish and Arab fighters in war-torn Syria, where a civil war and Russian strikes in support of President Bashar Al-Assad have further complicated the picture. "The few people of us who were watching this group develop from 2010 to 2014 knew very well that this was going to be a very long-term battle, and the idea that no US troops were going to be involved was just a fantasy," Lister said.

Though the United States claims more than 60 countries are part of its coalition, in reality America and just a few stalwart partners are carrying out almost all the work. Within weeks of the first strikes in Iraq, the coalition campaign spread to Syria. The fight later expanded to Afghanistan and, last week, the Pentagon quietly started an air campaign in the IS group's Libyan stronghold of Sirte. That campaign is supposed to last "weeks, not months," according to the Pentagon. —AFP

# 50 SENIOR REPUBLICAN NATIONAL SECURITY OFFICIALS REJECT TRUMP

**WASHINGTON:** Fifty senior Republican national security officials have issued a stinging rejection of their party's White House nominee Donald Trump, warning he would be "the most reckless president in American history" if elected. The group, some of whom already announced they would not vote for Trump, included former homeland security chiefs, intelligence directors, senior presidential advisors and a former US trade representative. They served under Republican presidents from Richard Nixon to George W Bush. "We are convinced that he would be a dangerous president and would put at risk our country's national security and well-being," they wrote in a statement published in The New York Times on Monday.

Their disavowal of the Republican presidential candidate was followed by another setback for Trump, when influential US Senator Susan Collins said yesterday he was "unworthy" of America's highest elective office, and will not receive her support. "I will not be voting for Donald Trump for president. This is not a decision I make lightly, for I am a lifelong Republican. But Donald Trump does not reflect historical Republican values nor the inclusive approach to governing that is critical to healing the divisions in our country," Collins wrote in an op-ed article appearing in Tuesday's Washington Post.

While the US security experts did not say they would vote for Democrat Hillary Clinton-indeed they expressed "doubts" about her-they were clear in stating that "none of us will vote for Donald Trump." They essentially declared the brash billionaire unfit for office, echoing Clinton's criticism by saying that Trump "lacks the character, values, and experience to be president" and displays "alarming ignorance of basic facts" of international politics.

The New York real estate mogul also has shown no willingness to learn about foreign affairs or national security threats, "acts impetuously" and lacks self control, the statement said. "He is unable or unwilling to separate truth from falsehood," the group wrote, saying Trump possesses a set of "dangerous qualities" that should disqualify him from the presidency. "We are convinced that in the Oval Office, he would be the most reckless president in American history."

They warned that the political neophyte's "erratic behavior" has alarmed America's closest allies, adding that he fails to recognize the indispensable nature of such diplomatic relationships. The signatories include Tom Ridge and Michael Chertoff, the first and second homeland security secretaries under president George W Bush, former director of National Intelligence John Negroponte and Bush-era CIA director Michael Hayden. Also in the group are former US Trade Representative and World Bank president Robert Zoellick and Eric Edelman, former national security advisor to vice president Dick Cheney. —AFP

# NAGASAKI MARKS 71ST ATOMIC BOMBING ANNIVERSARY

**TOKYO:** The Japanese city of Nagasaki ing point for thinking about a future free yesterday marked 71 years since its destruction by a US atomic bomb, with its mayor lauding a visit by US President Barack Obama to Hiroshima earlier this year. A bell tolled as thousands of people, including ageing survivors and relatives of victims, observed a minute's silence at 11:02 am, the exact moment of the blast.

Some 74,000 people died in the initial explosion, while thousands of others perished months or years later from radiation sickness. The attack came three days after the US dropped the first ever atomic bomb on Hiroshima, which ultimately killed 140,000 people.

Nagasaki Mayor Tomihisa Taue lauded Obama's landmark May visit to Hiroshima the first ever by a sitting US president. "Knowing the facts becomes the start-

of nuclear weapons," Taue said, calling on other world leaders to visit his city.

Local officials and those who survived the bombing called for strict adherence to Japan's post-war tradition of pacifism and were critical of the Japanese government. "The government of Japan, while advocating nuclear weapons abolition, still relies on nuclear deterrence," the mayor said, calling it a "contradictory state of affairs".

Toyokazu Ihara, 80, who survived the Nagasaki bombing, used his address to call for abolition of nuclear weapons and world peace.

"Nagasaki must be the last," he said, concluding his Japanese remarks with an English sentence intended for global citizens. Hiroshima mayor Kazumi Matsui on

the bombing of his city, also citing Obama's visit. He said the visit was proof the US President shared his city's view of the "absolute evil" of nuclear weapons.

Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, in his address in Nagasaki, called on world leaders to honor the global Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.

"We must not allow a repeat of the horrible experiences of Hiroshima and Nagasaki that happened 71 years ago," Abe said. Abe has moved to extend the scope of Japan's military and deepen the nation's alliance with Washington in the face of threats from China's expanding military strength and unpredictable North Korea. North Korea last week test fired a ballistic missile that landed in waters off Japan's coast for the first time. — AFP

### Iraq parliament lifts Speaker's immunity

BAGHDAD: Iraq's parliament yesterday voted to lift the immunity of its speaker and two lawmakers to allow for corruption allegations to be investigated. Speaker Salim Al-Juburi said in a statement that he had agreed to submit the lifting of his own immunity to a parliamentary vote. A majority of the 237 members in attendance subsequently voted to lift parliamentary immunity for Juburi and two others MPs, Mohammed al-Karbouli and Taleb Al-Maamari, a parliamentary official said. Juburi then testified before a judiciary commission in response to corruption allegations Defense Minister Khaled Al-Obeidi made publicly earlier this month, judiciary spokesman Abdelsattar Bayraqdar said in a statement. Juburi has denied the accusations against him, which Obeidi made while appearing in parliament to answer graft allegations he said were brought in retribution for his rejection of corruption. Corruption is widespread in Iraq's government, from senior officials to low-level functionaries, and while Iraqis have repeatedly demonstrated for change in the past year, little in the way of real reform has taken place.

### MH370 plunged into ocean at high speed

**SYDNEY:** MH370 plunged into the ocean at high speed up to 20,000 feet a minute-reinforcing analysis that the missing Malaysia Airlines jet crashed in the current search zone, a report said yesterday. The Boeing 777 disappeared on March 8, 2014 en route from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing with 239 people onboard. An extensive underwater hunt in the southern Indian Ocean has not yet found the crash site, fuelling speculation it may be outside the current search zone, particularly if someone was at the controls at the end of the flight. A manned plane could have been glided down, allowing it to enter the water outside the 120,000 square kilometer area being searched, some experts have suggested. But extensive testing by aircraft manufacturer Boeing and new Australian defense department data analysis both suggest that-regardless of the possible actions of one or both of the pilots-the jet dived into the ocean at high speed, The Australian reported.

### US delivers \$50 m worth of assistance to Lebanon

**BEIRUT:** The United States has delivered \$50 million worth of military assistance to Lebanon's army to help it battle against Muslim extremists near the border with Syria. US Ambassador to Lebanon Elizabeth H Richard told reporters at Beirut's port that the latest assistance is in "an entire ship full of military equipment." A US Embassy statement said the shipment includes 50 armored Humvees, 40 Howitzers and over 1,000 tons of ammunition. The US has been speeding up delivery of ammunition to help Lebanon's military combat jihadi groups near the border with Syria. In March, Washington delivered three Huey II helicopters, raising to 10 the number of such US-made aircraft in Lebanon's fleet Washington has provided more than \$1 billion in military assistance to Lebanon since 2006.

### Iran to auction property of a death row tycoon

TEHRAN: Iran said yesterday it would auction off property owned by billionaire Babak Zanjani, who was sentenced to death for corruption earlier this year. A number of luxury villas and apartments, shops and other properties will be sold, reported the Mizan Online newspaper, which is close to the judiciary. Bidders must make their offers in sealed envelopes by August 20, it added. Zanjani, 41, was sentenced to death for fraud and other financial crimes in March after a lengthy trial during which he was accused of fraudulently pocketing \$2.8 billion. He rose to prominence after the international community imposed sanctions on the Islamic republic's banks as punishment over its nuclear program.

### Mali says 5 soldiers missing after attack

**BAMAKO:** At least five Malian soldiers have gone missing after an attack in the central Mopti region, where armed Islamic extremists are active, a military source said yesterday. The assailants struck "one of our positions on Monday between the locations of Tenenkou and Sevare. We have no news of five of our soldiers," said the source, reached at the defense ministry. The source blamed the attack on Ansar Dine, a mainly Tuareg group that early in 2012 seized control of northern desert territory with two other movements, including Al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb (AQIM). The jihadists were ousted from major northern towns in a French-led military operation in 2013, but still launch attacks from desert hideouts.

### Sudan rebels sign **AU-brokered deal**

KHARTOUM: Prominent Sudanese rebel groups said yesterday they have signed a roadmap brokered by African Union mediators to end deadly conflicts in Sudan's strife-torn Darfur, Blue Nile and South Kordofan regions. Tens of thousands of people have been killed and millions displaced over the years in the three regions as ethnic minority groups rebelled against President Omar Al-Bashir's Arab-dominated government. While Khartoum representatives signed the roadmap at a previous round of talks in March in Addis Ababa, prominent rebel groups refused to come on board at the time. But on Monday they signed it in the Ethiopian capital.

# PAKISTAN LAWYERS GO ON STRIKE AFTER DOZENS KILLED IN ATTACK

### QUETTA ATTACK KILLS DOZENS OF LAWYERS

ISLAMABAD: Pakistani lawyers staged a nationwide strike yesterday after dozens of colleagues were slain in a suicide bombing that killed 74 people at a hospital in the southwestern city of Quetta. Medical staff said up to 60 of those killed in Monday's bombing at a government hospital were lawyers who had gathered to mourn the assassination earlier that day of the president of the Baluchistan Bar Association, Bilal Anwar Kasi. Yesterday morning, four of over one hundred people wounded, including two more lawyers, died in hospital, taking the toll to 74, said Abdul Rehman, the medical superintendent at the Civil Hospital Quetta.

Shops, businesses, schools and universities in the city and several other towns in the southern province of Baluchistan remained closed as the government announced three days of mourning. Islamic State was one of two Islamist militant groups to claim responsibility for the atrocity, although officials and analysts said they had doubts over whether the Middle Eastbased movement was behind the blast. It was the deadliest militant attack in Pakistan this year and the latest in a string of strikes on lawyers, seen by some militants as an extension of the state and so legitimate targets.

"How weak and pathetic are these people who target hospitals, where women and children, where patients, go to get treatment?" Ashtar Ausaf Ali, Pakistan's attorney general, said yesterday at a protest outside the Supreme Court in the capital Islamabad.

Supreme Court Bar President Ali Zafar alled for the government to do more to protect lawyers. "Lawyers are relatively more vocal against militancy and they are fighting cases against people accused of terrorism, so it would make sense that they are being targeted," said Ali Malik, a Lahorebased lawyer.

"An attack on lawyers makes a mockery of the law enforcement agencies, it undermines the promises of the state against terrorists and breeds fear among vulnerable

### **Doubts over claims**

The bombing in Quetta, the provincial capital of Baluchistan province, was initially claimed by Jamaat-ur-Ahrar, a faction of the Pakistani Taleban that is fighting to overthrow the government and impose strict Islamic law. Later, however, Islamic State said one of its fighters carried out the attack, in what would mark an escalation in the ability of the group, or its regional offshoots, to strike in Pakistan. "A martyr from the Islamic State detonated his explosive belt at a gathering of justice ministry employees and Pakistani policemen in the city of Quetta," Islamic State's Amaq news agency reported.

Some Pakistani analysts were sceptical. 'The ISIS claim seems very unconvincing," said Imtiaz Gul, director of the Center for Research and Security Studies in Islamabad. "The claim of responsibility by

Jamaat-ur-Ahrar is more credible," said Muhammad Amir Rana, head of the Pakistan Institute for Peace Studies. He noted that Jamaat had sworn loyalty to Islamic State's Middle East leadership in 2014, but later switched back to the Taleban. "Every time they have carried out an attack, they have taken responsibility independently (of Islamic State)," Rana said.

It remains unclear what ties, if any, Jamaat has to Islamic State, whose leadership is a rival to both the Taleban and Al-Qaeda over claims to represent the true Islamist Caliphate. In September 2014, Jamaat-ur-Ahrar rejected the Pakistani Taleban during a leadership struggle and swore allegiance to Islamic State, also known as Daesh. By March 2015, the group was again swearing loyalty to the main Pakistani Taleban. The reason for its return to the fold remains murky, but Jamaat also never specifically disayowed Islamic State. Only last week, Jamaat was added to the United States' list of global terrorists, triggering sanctions.

Baluchistan, which borders Afghanistan, is home to many militant groups, most notably sectarian outfits who have launched a campaign of suicide bombings and assassinations of ethnic Hazaras - Persian-speaking Shiites who mostly emigrated from Afghanistan and are a small minority of the Shiite population in Sunni-majority Pakistan. "Many groups based in Baluchistan have an anti-Shiite agenda, so they find ideological linkages with ISIS," said a military official who was based in Quetta until 2015. "But is ISIS present there to a degree that they can carry out this kind of well-planned, pre-meditated attack? I don't think that is possible."—Reuters

## AMBASSADOR TELLS UK: KEEP YOUR DOOR OPEN TO CHINA

LONDON: China has cautioned Britain against closing the door to Chinese money and said relations were at a crucial juncture after Prime Minister Theresa May delayed signing off on a \$24 billion nuclear power project. In China's sternest warning to date over May's surprise decision to review the building of Britain's first nuclear plant in decades, Beijing's ambassador to London said that Britain could face power shortages unless May approved the Franco-Chinese deal. "The China-UK relationship is at a crucial historical juncture. Mutual trust should be treasured even more," Liu Xiaoming wrote in the Financial Times. "I hope the UK will keep its door open to China and that the British government will continue to support Hinkley Point and come to a decision as soon as possible so that the project can proceed smoothly." The comments signal deep frustration in

Beijing at May's move to delay, her most striking corporate intervention since winning power in the political turmoil which followed Britain's June 23 referendum to leave the European Union. Her decision indicates a much more cautious view of Chinese investment and a willingness to take a tough line with EU allies such as French President Francois Hollande. Cast as the jewel illustrating a new "Golden Era" of relations between China and Britain, the Hinkley financing deal was signed in Downing Street during a state visit to Britain by President Xi Jinping last year.

### Golden era?

Under plans drawn up by former Prime Minister David Cameron, French utility EDF and China General Nuclear Power Corp would fund the cost of building two Areva European Pressurized Water Reactors at the Hinkley C nuclear plant in Somerset, in southern England. Britain has committed to pay a minimum price for the power generated by the plant for 35 years, though critics said London had agreed to

Hinkley is seen as the frontrunner to closer ties with China on nuclear issues, paving the way for tens of billions of dollars of investment and another two nuclear power plants with Chinese involvement. Cameron raised some eyebrows with allies by pitching Britain as the pre-eminent gateway to the West for investment from China and made London the biggest international trading centre for offshore yuan outside China. Britain is currently discussing an agreement for landmark financial services links. including a London-Shanghai stock connection.

In the comment published in the Financial Times yesterday, China's ambassador said Hinkley was not "some whimsical idea or rushed decision" and pointedly said that Chinese investment had flowed because both countries "respected and trusted each other". "If Britain's openness is a condition for bilateral co-operation, then mutual trust is the very foundation on which this is built," said Liu. Once Britain exits from the EU, London would need to clinch a new trade deal with China, whose \$11.3 trillion economy is currently more than four times as big as Britain's at \$2.4 trillion. Liu said Chinese companies had invested more in the United Kingdom than in Germany, France and Italy combined over the past five years.

### **Natural concerns**

Since May won the top job, Britain has repeatedly said that it values its relationship with China and that it was natural for the incoming government to want to look at the plans in detail. "This decision is about a huge infrastructure project and it's right that the new government carefully considers it," a government spokesman said. "We co-operate with China on a broad range of areas from the global economy to international issues and we will continue to seek a strong relationship with China." But Nick Timothy, May's influential joint chief of staff, also said last year that security experts were worried the state-owned Chinese group would have access to computer systems that could allow it to shut down Britain's energy production.

"Rational concerns about national security are being swept to one side because of the desperate desire for Chinese trade and investment," Timothy wrote in October 2015 in a column for a conservative news and comment website. China was buying British silence on human rights, Timothy said, and stated that British security services thought China's spies were working against UK interests. "No amount of trade and investment should justify allowing a hostile state easy access to the country's critical national infrastructure," he said. A final decision on Hinkley is due in September. — Reuters

# XI'S HERE TO STAY: JINPING TIPPED TO OUTSTAY TERM

**BEIJING:** Already China's most powerful leader in decades, President Xi Jinping will probably seek to extend his term to more than 10 years, analysts say, the first Communist Party chief to do so since Deng Xiaoping. The ruling party's leaders have reportedly gathered at their secretive annual Beidaihe retreat on the northern Chinese coast, where discussions are expected to focus on the composition of its next all-powerful Politburo Standing Committee (PSC).

The 19th Party Congress, slated for next year, will decide a new PSC line-up, traditionally seen as indicating Xi's most likely successor after he steps down, due in 2022. But Xi has thus far delayed anointing an heir. And while Chinese Communist leaders have often maintained influence after their official retirement, scholars and analysts increasingly believe Xi will try to stay in office beyond his standard term. "A lot of analysts now see it as a given" that Xi will seek to stay party general secretary, the country's most powerful post, said Christopher K Johnson, a former CIA analyst and now China specialist at the Washington-based Center for Strategic and International Studies.

Willy Lam, expert on politics at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, said there was a 60 to 70 percent chance that Xi would refuse to give up the role. Doing so would violate the unofficial rule set by Deng Xiaoping, who led China from 1978-1989, that general secretaries stay in office no longer than 10 years. That principle has helped smooth transfers of power within the party since the 1990s. As well as ensuring regular renewal at the top, and opportunities for different Communist Party factions to dominate at different times, the concept also seeks to prevent the emergence of a despot.

### 'No heir apparent'

China's constitution sets term limits for presidents and ministers, but there is no such rule for the party secretary. Analysts say if Xi's close ally Wang Qishan, a PSC cadre who is due to retire, is allowed a second term it could establish a precedent for the party chief. Xi has made his enduring ambition clear by installing himself as chairman of most of the powerful new groups within the party, said Victor Shih, professor at the University of California, San Diego. Doing so "increases the threshold for anyone to replace him," he said.

"Moreover, there is no heir apparent now." Xi has already smashed several unwritten party rules since ascending to general secretary in 2012, Johnson noted. His anti-corruption drive felled the once hugely powerful security chief Zhou Yongkang, breaking the tacit understanding that former top leaders were immune to such campaigns-and giving him an incentive to stay in power. More time as president could allow Xi to follow through on long-promised reforms and bolster his more assertive foreign policy in the South China Sea, experts say. Xi's allies could argue a longer term would let him pursue his ambitious targets of national rejuvenation and doubling 2010 per capita income by 2020, in time for the 100th anniversary of the party's founding. — AFP

Today, the cross-border trickle has become a torrent and everyone knows why the Indian-made pills are so valuable: They are bound for secret laboratories in lawless eastern Myanmar that churn out most of mainland Southeast Asia's methamphetamine, or "meth".

Cold pills contain pseudoephedrine, the main ingredient of meth, a highly addictive drug whose ever-soaring popularity is rattling governments across Asia. In recent months the Philippines has elected a president on a platform of harsh action against drug dealers, Indonesia has resumed executions of drug traffickers after a year-long hiatus and Thailand is wrestling with a soaring prison population. Myanmar's current boom in meth production would be impossible without a recent surge in pseudoephedrine smuggled from India's huge and ill-regulated pharmaceuticals sector, say police and narcotics experts.

The uninterrupted flow of the drug is highlighting a disconnect between countries in tackling a meth epidemic that the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) calls Asia's "number one drug threat". "It's big, big business," said Ye Htut, a former advisor to Myanmar's ex-President Thein Sein. He attributed a property boom in Kalay, the largest town in this otherwise impoverished region, to the profits made from smuggling pseudoephedrine.

Meth is sold in pill form as "ya ba", a Thai name meaning "crazy medicine", or as a more potent, crystalline substance known as "crystal meth", "ice" or "shabu". Each Indian cold pill can make one "ya ba" and costs only a few cents to produce. By the time it has crossed the border and reached Mandalay - Myanmar's northern capital and a major smuggling hub - the pill's value has increased roughly tenfold. Across mainland Southeast Asia, the UNODC estimates the meth trade was worth about \$15 billion in 2013.

### Cross-border route

The rugged and ethnically diverse region straddling the Indian border ranks among Myanmar's poorest, with no industry and modest infrastructure. Its main road is a two-lane highway linked by rickety bridges and plied by ox carts. It is here that Myanmar police have been finding thousands of the cold pills, hidden in rice sacks, packed into truck chassis or spilling from the luggage of cross-border bus passengers. In one bust here in mid-June, police intercepted a car carrying more than 60 kg (130 lbs) of Indian pseudoephedrine - enough to make more than a million "ya ba" pills.

Global demand for methamphetamine has created "new precursor chemical entrepreneurs in India", said the US State Department in a 2015 report. Experts believe many criminals who once smuggled drugs now prefer precursors, which offer high profits but much lighter penalties. Myanmar police say China is also a major supplier of pseudoephedrine. But with tighter controls there, and with greater demand for the chemical as meth use booms, drug producers have increasingly turned to India.

Pseudoephedrine is a controlled substance in India requiring all handlers to register with the authorities. In practice, the trade is poorly monitored, with Indian officials complaining of weak intelligencesharing between government agencies and

rare prosecutions of offenders. Raw pseudoephedrine is made in a handful of Indian factories, then moved through a network of wholesalers, drug makers, distributors and drugstores. It gets pilfered at every point along the way, say experts.

In a statement to Reuters, India's Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) said seizures had dropped after the country's narcotics laws were changed in 2013 to define pseudoephedrine as controlled. And indeed, police in Kalay and Tamu, Myanmar's two main districts bordering India, seized only 400 kg of pseudoephedrine last year, down from more than 3.5 tons in 2013. But that may well be because smugglers have found novel ways

to avoid detection. "It's highly likely that traffickers have just shifted approach," said Jeremy Douglas, the UNODC's Asia-Pacific head. Tamu district alone had more than 80 unofficial crossing points along its 125-km border with India, said Douglas, making it almost impossible to monitor. The Indian Embassy in Yangon did not respond to a request for comment on the problem.

### Drug problem

Already the world's second-largest producer, after Afghanistan, of opium and its derivative heroin, Myanmar is now also reporting record-breaking seizures of meth. In May, police intercepted a truck in northern Myanmar carrying 21 million ya ba pills

worth an estimated \$35 million. The booming drugs trade poses a challenge to the fledgling government of Nobel laureate Aung San Suu Kyi.

Rapid urbanization in the commercial capital Yangon is creating the kind of slums that have fuelled the increase in meth abuse in countries such as Thailand and the Philippines. Health experts are braced for an explosion in domestic meth use. Meanwhile, police in Mandalay, a transit point between the western frontier with India and the rebel-dominated eastern borderlands, say they are still making record seizures of Indian-made pseudoephedrine.

Greater regional integration, aided by Indian and Myanmar road-building programs, promised to boost both trade and trafficking, said the UNODC's Douglas. "India and Myanmar are cooperating to some extent but they're not doing a lot of joint operations or intelligence-sharing," he said. Myanmar police said most large drug and precursor shipments were smuggled through Moreh, the Indian border town opposite Tamu. They have arrested scores of couriers or "mules", but said they needed India's help to arrest the ringleaders.

An Indian man suspected of arranging a large pseudoephedrine shipment in 2013 sought refuge on the other side of the border, said Tamu police Chief Major Soe Naing. "Cooperation with India is quite weak so we haven't been able to catch him," he said. The NCB said Myanmar had not presented evidence that smuggling kingpins were hiding in India, or even that the pseudoephedrine it had seized was Indianmade. "It is coming from other countries too," said a top NCB official, who asked not to be named because he wasn't authorized to speak to journalists. — Reuters

## Congestion made worse by President's drug war

MANILA: Philippine officials said yesterday the government would build new jails to address severe congestion made worse by President Rodrigo Duterte's drug war, describing conditions as "inhumane" and "unacceptable". AFP photographs of Quezon City Jail, where thousands of inmates take turns to sleep on an open-air basketball court and a staircase, were an "eye-opener" for authorities to hasten the construction of a new facility, according to vice mayor Joy Belmonte.

Quezon City officials Monday signed an agreement to donate land to the national government for a new prison. The facility in the northern district of Manila would replace the jail built six decades ago for 800 inmates but now houses almost 4,000. "The photos are really unacceptable. Seeing inmates sleep on top of each other because of the lack of space, I feel it's a violation of human rights, an urgent matter that must be addressed," Belmonte said. "It's good that this is exposed before the international reading public as an eye-

opener," added the vice mayor, who said she had heard reports of overcrowding before but visited the facility for the first time in July with an AFP photographer.

Human Rights Watch criticized the conditions last week, saying it was "straight out of Dante's 'Purgatory'", referring to the 13th century Italian writer's description of the realm where souls await judgment. Interior Secretary Ismael Sueno said the government would allocate funds to build new jails, with 80 percent of new detainees accused of drug-related crimes resulting from Duterte's crackdown.

Duterte, who took office on June 30, ordered a bloody war on crime that has left 889 people dead since the May elections, according to the country's largest broadcaster ABS-CBN. Police have reported arresting more than 5,000 people for drugs offences as part of the campaign. Sueno said his department was also planning the construction of more rehabilitation centers. "(President Duterte) is really concerned not just about arrests but also the rehabilita-

tion of drug addicts," the minister said.

Even before Duterte's presidency, the Philippine penal system was ranked as the third most congested in the world, according to the University of London's Institute for Criminal Policy Research. In Quezon City, the government is working with the International Committee of the Red Cross to finalize the design for a new facility that can house 6,000 inmates by 2019. "It's a modern facility and we want it to be on par with other jails in Southeast Asia," Xavier Solda of the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology said.

## Top judge rebuffed

Meanwhile, President Rodrigo Duterte warned the Philippines' top judge yesterday to let him pursue a deadly anti-crime campaign that has left hundreds of suspects dead, suggesting otherwise he would impose "martial law". Supreme Court chief justice Lourdes Sereno criticized Monday Duterte's public shaming of seven lower court judges for alleged involvement in the

narcotics trade, adding that one of the judges was murdered eight years ago. "Go ahead and try to stop me. Would you rather that I declared martial law?" Duterte said in a speech to soldiers during a visit to a military camp in the southern Philippines.

"Let's not kid each other ma'am, and do not force the issue," Duterte warned Sereno. You do not warn me. I warn you. I can order everyone in the executive department not to honor you," he added. "Please do not create a confrontation, a constitutional war. We will all lose," the president added. Sereno had told Duterte in a letter that it was her sole responsibility to impose punishment on judicial "misfits", and that publicly naming them, even without charges filed against them, had put their lives in danger. "To safeguard the role of the judges as the protector of constitutional rights, I would caution them very strongly against 'surrendering' or making themselves physically accountable to any police officer in the absence of any... warrant of arrest," she added. — Agencies

**BEIJING:** A Chinese man applying for a certificate of no criminal record had his request denied when police told him he was in fact dead, having been executed a decade ago for kidnapping, a report said. The man, a resident of the southern metropolis of Guangzhou surnamed Chen. requested the document to apply for a job. "The police told me that... I had already committed the crime of kidnapping and the death sentence penalty had already been carried out, so I was technically speaking already dead," he said, according to Guangdong Radio and Television's verified social media account. The mix-up was the result of his having the same name and identification card number as a criminal executed in 2006. Chen, 45, said that he had lived a perfectly normal life until he applied for the background check, even receiving entry-exit permits for Hong Kong and Macau without any trouble. # Woman charged with biting off officer's ear

**SALEM:** A Massachusetts woman charged with biting off a portion of a rookie police officer's ear during her arrest outside a Salem bar has been held without bail. Emma Wiley pleaded not guilty Monday in to charges including mayhem, assault and battery causing serious bodily injury, assault and battery on a police officer and resisting arrest. Prosecutors say Patrolwoman Jessica Rondinelli responded to reports of a fight outside a city bar at about 1 am Sunday. The police report says while Rondinelli was putting the 19-year-old Wiley in a cruiser, Wiley bit off a piece of the officer's ear. Doctors were unable to re-attach it. Wiley's attorney said his client is a Salem State University student who suffers from depression, anxiety and obsessive-compulsive disorder. Rondinelli's first police shift was July 1.

## Chinese tourist kills woman at luxury Kenya safari lodge

NAIROBI: A Chinese tourist stabbed a woman to death and seriously wounded her husband after demanding they vacate a table at a luxury Kenyan safari lodge, police said yesterday. The incident occurred at Keekorok Lodge in Masai Mara, a large game reserve in southwestern Kenya, where the couple-also Chinese-were having dinner. The assailant, identified as Lee Changqin, is said to have demanded that they leave their table, prompting an argument, before he stabbed them both in the chest. Rift Valley county police Chief Gideon Kibunjah said the tourist was arrested and undergoing interrogation before being arraigned in court. "The woman died while undergoing treatment in hospital while her husband is still in hospital," Kibunjah said by telephone. "The man is in custody."

### An intruder tried to climb Buckingham Palace fence LONDON: London police say an intruder tried to climb a

security fence at Buckingham Palace, but did not gain access to landmark building. The Metropolitan Police say officers monitoring CCTV cameras saw the 22-year-old from Croydon and arrested him yesterday inside a security perimeter on suspicion of trespassing on a protected site. Police say he had been drinking, was not armed and was detained without using stun guns. The breach is not believed to be terrorism related. Several intruders have breached security at the queen's London residence over the years - including a man convicted of murder who climbed a wall in May while Queen Elizabeth II was at home. Buckingham Palace declined to comment on the intruder, but the royal family was not there at the time.

## Octogenarian Polish temptress drugged and swindled suitors

**WARSAW:** Polish authorities have arrested an 80-year-old woman who allegedly drugged and then robbed a string of senior citizen suitors she met through newspaper lonely hearts adverts. During dinner, the predatory pensioner sprinkled lorazepam-a drug prescribed to treat anxiety but which induces sleep-onto her victim's food, a regional court in Brzesko, southern Poland, heard. In one case, she stole 8,000 zloty (1,800 euros, \$2,000) in jewelry, electronics and cash from a 78-year-old who had invited her to his home in the nearby village of Szczurow, the online edition of the Polska The Times reported yesterday.

# FOREIGN FACEBOOK LOVE REVIVES CAMBODIA PM 'CLICK FARM' ROW

PHNOM PENH: With its regular live broadcasts, routine tirades and daily-often curiously intimate-photo posts, the Facebook page of Cambodian strongman Hun Sen has won a remarkable five million fans. But a surge of "likes" from countries including India and the Philippines has reignited allegations that his digital adoration is purchased from so-called "click farms". The 64-year-old prime minister, a once self-confessed tech dinosaur who tolerates little dissent, has embraced Facebook with gusto in the last year after opponents used the platform to reach out to younger voters.

He has vowed to remain prime minister until he is 74 with the next elections due in 2018. To do so he will need the support of Cambodia's youth-a huge, tech-savvy demographic who voted in droves for the opposition at the last polls, wearied by the endemic corruption, rights abuses and political repression seen as the hallmarks of Hun Sen's rule. With loyalists controlling nearly all of Cambodia's mainstream media outlets, Hun Sen was initially wary of social media. But in the last year he has embraced the digital sphere-while ramping up prosecutions against people for online comments.

His slick page now documents everything from live broadcasts of speeches and meetings with villagers, to more personal moments like the premier kicking back in a white bathrobe or sporting a wet, seethrough singlet at the beach. But that success has been dogged by allegations that a significant chunk of fans come from "click farms"-networks of fake and real users controlled by digital middlemen who sell likes. In recent months, opposition groups, local media, analysts and even many of Hun Sen's own Facebook followers have all remarked on the unusual and erratic surges in likes his page receives.

### Nearly half of likes foreign

An AFP analysis of Hun Sen's Facebook followers over the last six months using data from SocialBakers.com shows two periods when overseas likes have dramatically spiked-the most recent in the last three weeks. Only 55 percent of Hun Sen's five million Facebook followers now come from inside Cambodia. Many of the likes originate in countries notorious for hosting click farms such as India, Indonesia and the Philippines.

In contrast, 82 percent of followers for Sam Rainsy-the country's most prominent opposition politician-are Cambodian. That has led Rainsy, who currently lives in self-exile in France, to accuse Hun Sen of buying friends. "In his deceitful but childish logic, Hun Sen needs to push his popularity on Facebook in order to justify his repressive policies," he said by email. India now accounts for the largest chunk of overseas love for Hun Sen's page-some 562,000 fans,

or 11.4 percent, dwarfing even neighboring Thailand where there is a huge diaspora of Cambodian workers.

In March and April, Indian likes tripled from 175,000 to 517,000. Then from early May the rate of likes dipped slightly, only to once more rebound between July 4 and August 1 taking the number from 512,000 to 560,000. Similar patterns have taken place this year with fans from the Philippines and Indonesia. — AFP

### EXECUTED IRAN NUKE SCIENTIST UNFAIRLY TRIED: MOT

DUBAI/WASHINGTON: Iranian security forces may have pressured nuclear scientist Shahram Amiri, hanged last week for spying for the United States, to admit to crimes he did not commit, his mother said in an interview this week. Amiri leapt to the global spotlight in 2010 when he claimed first that U.S. agents had abducted him and then that he was in the United States of his own free will. The same year, he returned to Iran where he was welcomed as a hero but then detained and tried on charges that he divulged nuclear secrets.

"When I was saying goodbye to him before his exe

cution, he told me not to be sad as he had done nothing wrong," Marzieh Amiri told Reuters in a telephone interview. "He asked me to tell everyone that he was innocent. He was saying his conscience was clear," she

said. Her son's closed-door trial was unfair and he was not properly represented, she said. She did not know the full name of the lawyer, who as a result could not be reached for comment.

"They should have held a public trial," she said. "I am not angry with the government or the Supreme Leader (of Iran, Avatollah Ali Khamenei). I am angry with extremist security forces who were on his case, trying to prove he was a spy and who maybe forced him to confess to things he hadn't done." Iranian judiciary officials could not be reached for comment. Gholamhossein Mohseni Ejei, spokesman for Iran's judiciary, told reporters Amiri received a fair trial and the case followed standard judicial procedure. "He ... had contacted Iran's number one enemy, America, and had given our

most secret and vital information to them." Mohseni Eiei said on Sunday, according to the state broadcaster.

### 'I am an Iranian'

In June 2010, Iranian state television showed Amiri, then 32, saying in a video he was in Arizona after US and Saudi intelligence forces kidnapped him a year eallier during a religious pilgrimage abroad. In a second video soon afterwards, Amiri said he was in the United States voluntarily and wanted to dispel "rumors" that had been spread about him. "I am an Iranian, and I have taken no step against my homeland," he said. As a young man with a talent for electronics in the Iranian city of Kermanshah, Amiri would tote his toolbox to friends' houses and fix their broken appliances, his mother said. He won a coveted scholarship from the defense ministry to further his studies and eventually became a researcher in radiation safety at the defense ministry-affiliated Malek Ashtar University of Technology, visiting sites associated with Iran's nuclear program. According to a US official involved in the case, the Central Intelligence Agency recruited Amiri in Iran

and helped extract him using the pilgrimage.

But US officials had doubts about the depth of Amiri's knowledge and access to the most sensitive information. Amiri was questioned, given a new identity and a home in Arizona, and paid around \$5 million, the officials said. However he began telling his handlers he missed his young son and wanted to return to Iran though they warned he likely would face imprisonment or worse and might never see his son. Arriving in Tehran in July 2010, he was greeted by his son, reporters and Iran's deputy foreign minister. Someone placed a wreath around his neck and he flashed a "V" for victory while clutching his son.

### Clear Conscience

Marzieh Amiri said her son was free on his return and even took a vacation in Iran with his family. "But one day they suddenly arrested him ... When we followed up, (the security forces) said, 'It's for his own protection. He is our guest". He was held in isolation in Tehran, his mother said. His wife filed for divorce, and he became nervous and suffered from high blood pressure. "His loneliness was killing him," she said, adding she visited him once or twice a month. "He told me he prefers to die as he could not tolerate the isolation anymore." Last week, officials brought his corpse to Kermanshah. Rope marks on his neck indicated he had been hanged, his mother said. — Reuters

In previous years, Kuwait built up a sovereign wealth fund worth around \$600 billion that is invested mostly in the United States, Europe and Asia. Kuwait is projecting a deficit of \$28.9 billion in the current fiscal year which began on April 1. As part of efforts to reduce the shortfall, the Cabinet last week decided to raise the

price of petrol by up to 83 percent, the first increase in almost two decades. Last year, it raised the prices of diesel and kerosene. It has also decided to lift electricity and water charges on foreign residents. The ratings agency Moody's said late Monday that the fuel price reforms will boost Kuwait's credit ratings because they will lower current expenditures and bolster government finances. — AFP

He said the government told MPs that it was time for Kuwait to follow the steps taken by other Gulf states, because Kuwait is the last member of the six GCC states to take the petrol hike decision, while other states took it several months ago.

The minister said the government heard proposals by MPs, particularly the financial committee proposal, to an amount of fuel free of charge and another amount at subsidized prices to citizens, adding that the government is keen to cooperate with the Assembly regarding the issue. He however stated that the government

would go ahead with the new price rises.

MP Abdullah Maayouf said lawmakers presented proposals to the government, mainly the financial commit-tee's study, which can achieve reforms, rationalization and not harm citizens. He said the lawmakers told the government that the hike decision represents an embar rassment for them and the Assembly before the Kuwaiti voters. MP Humoud Al-Hamdan said lawmakers urged the government to prevent any increase in the prices of commodities as a result of the petrol price hike, and the government team said they will prevent any price rises. He expected that the government will respond to pro-posals by MPs before the hike decision becomes effective on Sept 1.

Now with Russia mired in economic crisis due to Western sanctions over Ukraine and low oil prices along with Turkey's outlook flagging, both men want to get business started again. Erdogan said that he now wanted to see the TurkStream project "done as fast as possible", while Putin said construction could start "in the nearest future". The Turkish leader also insisted that the two sides were once again targeting a very ambitious trade

turnover of \$100 billion by 2024.

The earlier uptick in relations between Turkey and Russia was built on a macho friendship between Putin and Erdogan, two combative leaders in their early 60s credited with restoring confidence to their nations in the wake of financial crises but also criticized for clamping down on human rights. But after such a bitter dispute

which saw Putin accuse Erdogan of stabbing Russia in the back and profiting from an illegal oil trade with the Islamic State group - it will take a lot for the pair to reheat rela-

The two strongmen leaders conspicuously skirted one major issue dividing them and that lay at the heart of their falling out - the war in Syria. Putin and Erdogan said they would start discussing the conflict after the press conference but the Russian leader insisted both sides were committed to finding a peaceful solution. Russia is flying a bombing campaign in support of President Bashar Al-Assad while Turkey is fiercely opposed to the Syrian leader. Erdogan insisted in an interview with Russian media ahead of the talks that Assad must still go - a position opposed by Putin - but said that the conflict could now become the focus for renewed cooperation between the two sides. —AFP

# SOUTH AFRICA'S ANC SOUL-SEARCHES AFTER VOTE HEMORRHAGE

he ruling African National Congress' historic losses in South Africa's local elections have called into question the leadership of President Jacob Zuma as head of the continent's most industrialized nation. The ANC last week suffered what analysts called a "savage indictment", garnering less than 54 percent of ballots cast - an eight-point drop from the last local poll in 2011 and its worst showing since the fall of white-minority rule in 1994.

Of the country's six most populous cities, the ANC won an outright majority in only one: Durban, Zuma's traditional stronghold. But it suffered embarrassingly in the capital Pretoria where it came second to the main opposition Democratic Alliance, which also scored big in Nelson Mandela Bay, a southern municipality named after the country's iconic late leader. The election was largely seen as a referendum on Zuma's rule, but it also highlighted the declining popularity of the party that led South Africa's anti-apartheid struggle.

And as Mandela's party reels from weak leadership and political divisions, some in the ANC admit that all is not well. "There is something wrong on a national level that we are not paying attention to," the party's Secretary General Gwede Mantashe said at the weekend.

### 'Big Trouble'

Analysts say the party leadership has been stubborn in refusing to rein in its controversial president. Zuma, who has three more years to serve out his term, has been dogged by scandal throughout his presidency. Last month, South Africa's highest court ruled he pay back \$500,000 of public funds spent upgrading his private Nkandla residence with facilities including a chicken coop and a swimming pool. The ANC has staunchly defended him.


But after the poor showing at the polls, the party would be "much more open to a change of leader-ship than they would have a been one week ago," said Richard Calland, a political analyst at the University of Cape Town. "Urgent steps must be taken (to) tackle the elephant in the room. It is clear that President Jacob Zuma has become a huge liability," wrote columnist Onkgopotse Tabane in the Business Day newspaper on Monday.

Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa - an antiapartheid heavyweight - is the presumed frontrunner to replace Zuma should he be forced out before the end of his term. "Where we have shown areas of weakness, we are going to get better and improve that's who we are," the unionist-turnedbusinessman said last week as the poor results poured in. Critics say urban and middle class voters have begun to tire of the continuous controversy surrounding 74-year-old Zuma, and warn of a serious backlash if the ANC fails to act fast. "The ANC is in big trouble," analyst Koffi Kouakou told AFP. "The only way to perhaps attempt to save the ANC is by having President Zuma resign and having the team that surrounds him cleaned up. If not, the ANC is in real big trouble in the long term."

But Zuma, who has thus far survived every curveball thrown his direction, may not be on his way out just yet. "I don't think he is likely to go without a fight," said Calland. "It's more likely he will survive until the end of next year," Calland said - when the ANC may vote to recall him at its next national elective congress.

In the meantime at least two rival ANC camps will start wrangling to succeed Zuma - one in support of Ramaphosa, and the other backing Zuma's ex-wife and outgoing chairwoman of the African Union Commission, Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma. Meanwhile, "political uncertainty will drive continued policy confusion in the mining, energy, power, private security, and agriculture sectors, while frustrating cost-cutting measures," said EXX Africa. A downgrade of South Africa's debt by at least one credit ratings agency to junk status "is almost inevitable this year," the intelligence company warned. —AFP

# ATATURK REVIVAL A SYMBOL OF FRAGILE UNITY

fter years of being gradually eclipsed as President Tayyip Erdogan forges a "new Turkey" with Islam firmly at its heart, the secular republic's founder Mustafa Kemal Ataturk has, for now at least, made a comeback in the wake of a failed coup. At a rally of more than a million people in Istanbul on Sunday, Erdogan drew a parallel between the spirit of the young officer who founded modern Turkey in 1923 and the civilians who took to the streets on July 15 to try to stop rogue soldiers in tanks and helicopters from seizing power.

"The belief that helped war veteran Mustafa Kemal start and win the war of independence was running through all Turkey's cities on July 15," Erdogan told the Istanbul rally, portraits of himself and Ataturk blowing in the breeze on either side of the huge stage. From a leader bent on raising a "pious generation", it seemed a major gesture of conciliation, an attempt to bridge a deep divide in Turkish society reaching back to 1923, when Ataturk forged the secular republic from the ruins of an Ottoman theocracy and banished Islam from public life.

Since the failed coup, Ataturk's portrait has been hung from the headquarters of the ruling AK Party, founded by Erdogan and rooted in political Islam, and its leaders have repeatedly invoked him - a revered figure for the country's secularists - as a symbol of unity. Kemal Kilicdaroglu, leader of the main opposition CHP, the party of Ataturk, told Sunday's rally a "door of compromise" had been opened in the nation of almost 80 million and that a new Turkey had been ushered in in the wake of the coup.

But for all the euphoria, sustaining such a spirit of cooperation would mean overcoming deep division over the direction of a nation with a secular constitution but overwhelmingly Muslim population. "This is a limited consensus. It's a very basic agreement that democracy is better than a military junta and that we all want justice. Nobody expects anyone to forget where they stood on July 14," said a senior government official.

Engin Altay, a senior CHP lawmaker, said the AK Party appeared to be invoking Ataturk to try to quell an atmosphere of "pessimism and panic" after the coup attempt and said it was

an open question whether the spirit of unity would last. "It depends on whether, after emerging from this trauma, the AK Party can adopt a compromise policy without becoming drunk on, or poisoned by, power. If it fails to do so and says 'we got power from the people and will do whatever we say', they will again slam the state against the wall," he told Reuters.

### 'Marriage of Convenience'

Erdogan has cautiously pushed a conservative Islamist agenda since the AKP came to power in 2002. Opponents see in his promotion of religious education, tighter laws on alcohol, and strictures on daily life an attempt to undermine the country's secular foundations. Ataturk's presence has gradually been felt less, having for decades loomed large, his piercing blue eyes staring from posters, his statue in pride of place in schools, public buildings and town squares. The CHP was in uproar in 2013 over the removal of his silhouette and the Turkish Republic abbreviation from state medals and some public buildings.

But the coup bid, which Erdogan says was staged by the followers of US-based Turkish cleric Fethullah Gulen, has provided a common enemy. Secularists loathe Gulen's religious movement, whose members have assumed prominent positions in the state bureaucracy, and are pleased to see it under attack. More than 60,000 people in the military, judiciary, civil service and education have been detained, suspended or placed under investigation over alleged links to Gulen since the coup.

The government may be forced as a result to work more with its secularist opponents, commonly known as Kemalists, as it replaces purged officials, particularly in the military, which for decades saw itself as the guardian of the secular order. "This requires the government to recalibrate its relations with Kemalism ... which it has demonized throughout its 14-year rule," said Gonul Tol, director of the Washington-based Middle East Institute's Center for Turkish Studies. "The military will have to accept working under an Islamist government while the government will have to respect the Kemalist core of the military," she said. "But I don't think this marriage of convenience will last. Once the government has enough loyal personnel ... the Kemalists will be discarded."

### Historic Opportunity

A return to the founding principles of the modern republic could help ease divisions in a country that has become increasingly polarised in recent years. But in Erdogan's references to Ataturk, some see political opportunism rather than a sincere attempt to bridge an ideological rift. "The switch is the result of strategic necessity rather than personal choice," said Deniz Ulke Aribogan, international relations professor at Istanbul University. "This brutal coup attempt created an opportunity for Erdogan to become the president of the whole country ... We have to wait and see what comes next," she said.

Erdogan's core supporters see him as the champion of the pious Anatolian masses, a strongman restoring religion to the center of public life after decades of rule by what they see as Western-facing Kemalist elites. He has been careful in his choice of words, referring to Ataturk simply as Mustafa Kemal, his name as a military officer when he led the Turkish National Movement to victory in the war of independence after the defeat of the Ottoman Empire. Ataturk, "Father of the Turks" was bestowed on him a decade later, after he introduced reforms replacing Arabic with Latin script and promoting Western dress and women's rights. Some in conservative religious circles have already questioned the references to him, criticizing what they say legitimizes a secularist ideology they battled for decades. "All they've done is feed the idea that the ideology of Ataturk is the only foundation for legitimacy in politics and that other movements are illegitimate," wrote columnist Hakan Albayrak in the conservative Karar newspaper, criticizing those who hung Ataturk's image on the AKP building.

Parts of the crowd booed as Kilicdaroglu spoke at Sunday's rally, dismissing his call that politics should now be kept out of the mosques, as well as the courthouses and barracks. His presence on the stage alongside Erdogan would have been unthinkable three weeks ago. It could yet cost the CHP some supporters, who remain suspicious of Erdogan's motivation. "I don't find this situation sincere at all. They can't even say the word Ataturk. For now, it suits them. If it suited them, tomorrow they would start insulting him," said Burcu Ural, a cafe owner in Istanbul's bohemian Beyoglu district. —Reuters

## HOLY COWS, HINDU CRUSADERS CLOUD MODI REFORM

wo miles down the road from the white marble walls of the fabled Taj Mahal, a heavyset man crouches in the dirt of a cow shed and explains how the future of India belongs to him. Digvijay Nath Tiwari is commander of a vigilante group that claims 5,000 members in the northern city of Agra, and which cultivates informants, swarms shop owners, ambushes trucks at night and metes out extra-judicial violence, all for one cause: Protecting the holy cow, an animal held sacred by Hindu beliefs.

Across the country, hardline Hindu groups have made headlines after being captured on video insulting and beating men they accuse of involvement in cow slaughter. "Retaliation is important at times," said Tiwari, as he sat with 17 men squeezed around a straw mat on the shed floor. His cell phone contained photographs of stick-wielding men rushing to the aid of fallen cattle. Local police say they cannot stop Tiwari's actions, laying the blame partly on lax laws. The "gau rakshaks", or cow protectors, are inflaming tensions among India's religions and castes. They risk undermining Prime Minister Narendra Modi's efforts to focus on economic advancement, even as the right-wing Hindu nationalist forces that got him elected promote their own agenda. The implications reach far beyond the winding alleyways of Agra. Social and religious stability are key to future assumptions of prosperity in India, currently the world's fastest expanding major economy.

"India will remain one of the strongest growth stories in the region," a Goldman Sachs strategist said in April, echoing the sentiment of many foreign investors. Yet such outlooks built on macro-analysis risk missing a ground truth: If the rightwing groups empowered by Modi's rise do not stop antagonizing minorities, then the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) plans for nurturing that growth will not easily come to pass.

### Changing Focus

Cow slaughter is illegal in most of India, an overwhelmingly Hindu nation. However, it had long been tolerated under the Congress party, which ruled the country for most of its independent history and prides itself on protecting Muslims and lower castes who ply the meat and leather trade. Now the Hindu nationalist BJP is in power, and that is changing as vigilante groups gain prominence. And Modi, while saying he's concerned, has been either unwilling or unable to halt their more extreme actions.

The prime minister was trained and nurtured by hardline Hindu organizations that were instrumental in his rise from the son of a train station tea seller to leader of the world's biggest democracy. Once at the helm, however, he has focused on more pragmatic and inclusive economic issues: Spurring growth and creating enough jobs for a rapidly expanding workforce. These initiatives could be derailed by a narrower, Hindu nationalist agenda aimed at protecting symbols made sacrosanct by religious texts and countering a perceived threat of foreign influences.

In a speech on Saturday night in New Delhi, Modi lashed out at the cow protectors. "I feel so angry at times. Some people who are engaged in anti-social activities for the whole night wear the mask of 'gau rakshaks' in the day," he said. A senior aide to Modi, who is approaching the halfway mark of his five-year tenure, said at the end of July that while the leader is aware of the social and economic implications, "we cannot

do much to stop cow protection forces ... cow protection is integral to our core support base."

### Dalits Feel Under Siege

The violence of cow vigilante groups this year, some of it caught in disturbing videos on the Internet, has unsettled minority groups. One clip from the western state of Gujarat shows four men, shirtless, tied to a bumper being whipped with rods. The victims were Dalits, or Indians at the bottom of the caste hierarchy who traditionally take away cow carcasses which can then be used for leather. In another, from the northern state of Haryana, two people are made to sit on the road and eat a concoction including cow dung. They were reportedly Muslims, and the footage was taken during Ramadan, the Islamic month of fasting.

While the BJP does not bank on the support of many Muslims, it does want to secure the votes of the Dalits, a caste formerly known as untouchables. Together, the two groups account for about 30 percent of India's population, a major consideration with important state elections due next year and a national ballot set for 2019. Chandra Bhan Prasad, a prominent Dalit writer and adviser to the Dalit Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, compared the violence to that of Ku Klux Klan racism in the United States. "It's like India's version of KKK - the past was great so long as these blacks were under our thumb, society was beautiful. So, how to control these Dalits?"

### 'Cow Not Just an Animal'

The Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), the nation's umbrella rightwing Hindu organization which helped create the BJP, does not appear willing to tackle cow protection forces, blaming outlaws for causing the trouble. "The

cow is not just an animal. We have an emotional and religious attachment to it and we want to make it the center of our economic activity," said a senior RSS leader in New Delhi, who asked not to be named so he could speak more frankly. "Vigilantes are instructed to follow the rules and they are a disciplined force. We admire their work."

Champat Rai, a leader of the Hindu activist Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP), or World Hindu Council, a group formed by RSS leadership which oversees cow groups, was more direct. "I am a cow patriot and want to free cows from the slavery of Muslim butchers," he said. "It's better we shed our blood to save the blood of cows." In Agra, some 220 km, south of New Delhi, there has already been bloodshed, and the threat of more to come.

One prominent Dalit businessmen in the city, H K Pippal, said recently at his shoe factory that he had a plan should the cow protection gang try to interfere with his operations and the cow leather it uses. "I am very powerful, my workers could kill them." Tiwari, the cow group leader, blames the butchers for much of the problem. "It's not just that the butchers get beaten," he said. "They attack us and threaten to kill us. It is a serious clash." Tiwari acknowledged having four criminal cases pending against him, but said he was innocent in all of them.

In February this year, the vice president of the VHP in Agra, who was also a senior member of Tiwari's group, was surrounded by a group of five Muslims while walking from a temple to his furniture shop, according to a police report. The men had previously been targeted by the cow protectors for allegedly dealing in beef, according to Tiwari. One of them boasted: "You think that you are a big leader, we'll teach you a lesson today," said the police report. —Reuters

Chairman of selectors Courtney Browne thanked Sammy, 32, for his contribution and expected Brathwaite, who blasted four successive sixes off a Ben Stokes over in the April 3 World Twenty20 final in Kolkata, would prove an inspiring captain. "Brathwaite is one of the most talented players in the T20 format of the game and his humble and committed approach to the game can inspire young and upcoming players," he added. **LAHORE:** Pakistan yesterday recalled paceman Umar Gul after a 15-month lay-off in the squad for the two one-day internationals in Ireland and five in England starting later this month. The 32-year-old last played a one-day match in Dhaka against Bangladesh in April 2015 before being discarded over his lack of form and fitness. He has 173 one-day wickets from 126 matches in a storied career, marred by recent injury problems.

Azhar Ali will lead the side which has uncapped 22-year-old allrounder Hasan Ali, but there was no place for opener Ahmed Shehzad and middle-order batsman Umar Akmal. Pakistan Cricket Board chairman Shaharyar Khan last week said both players were axed from the initial squad of 31 because of discipline issues. Umar has not played for Pakistan since the 2015 World Cup held in Australia and New Zealand.

"This squad is a blend of youth and experience and the selectors hoped it will do well," said chief selector Inzamam-ul-Haq. "We have included some young players like Ali to build the team for the future.'

Ali took 20 wickets in eight matches for Pakistan's second team on the England tour that ended earlier this month. Pakistan has lost the last three of its four one-day series, sliding to as low as ninth in the limited overs rankings.

Pakistan will play the final Test against England at The Oval starting Thursday before leaving for Ireland, where they play two one-day internationals in Dublin on August 18 and 20. Pakistan will then play five one-day internationals against England in Southampton (August 24), Lord's (August 27), Nottingham (August 30), Leeds (September 1) and Cardiff (September 4).

Pakistan also face England in the only Twenty20 international at Old Trafford on September 7, the squad for which will be named at a later date.

This textbook larceny is being played out each day on the beachside cafes along Ipanema. Pickpockets also ply Copacabana and there is also a more dangerous version. Sometimes the attacker just takes out a knife and puts it to the throat of his victim.

Around the Olympics, thefts and muggings have become the talk of the town. A government minister, athletes and coaches and press photographers have all fallen victim. The danger lurks from the Rio media village to stadiums, and the cafes on the upscale seafront Ipanema district. The 'Cariocas', as the inhabitants of Rio are known, have long got used to the threat of crime, whether theft or murderous muggings. # ENGLISH PREMIER LEAGUE ALL STARS HUNT DOWN LEICESTER

**LONDON:** Jaw-dropping new broadcast deals totalling 8.3 billion pounds (\$10.9 billion, 9.8 billion euros) have enabled the English Premier League to assemble a dazzling galaxy of stars for the 2016-17 season. Jose Mourinho will have Zlatan Ibrahimovic and Paul Pogba at his disposal at Manchester United, while Pep Guardiola has authorised a splurge of over 100 million pounds since becoming Manchester City manager. With Chelsea and Liverpool also spending big and Arsenal and Tottenham Hotspur looking to build on positive campaigns, Leicester City's odds of repeating May's fairytale title success are only 33-1.

Claudio Ranieri's men famously defied odds of 5,000-1 to win the title in May, but he has warned: "We know very well we are the champions, but we are the underdogs.

"There are six big teams who want to win. They want to kill us." England's 20 elite clubs took a month to break through the 500 million pounds barrier

in transfer spending and they are tipped to surpass the one billion pounds mark by the time the window closes on August 31. The beginning of the Guardiola era at City, who finished fourth last season, has heralded a rejuvenation of the League Cup holders' playing squad.

Young talents such as Leroy Sane and Gabriel Jesus have arrived for combined fees exceeding 100 million pounds. Everton centre-back John Stones could yet follow. While Guardiola's arrival at the Etihad Stadium has been in the pipeline for years, his former El Clasico sparring partner Mourinho has alighted across town at Old Trafford with a degree of haste.

### **MOURINHO REBUILDS**

After two years of stagnation under Louis van Gaal, for whom FA Cup success came too late to save his job, United's board has tasked Mourinho with the responsibility of restoring the club to former glories.

He will be assisted by Ibrahimovic, whose late goal sank Leicester in Sunday's Community Shield, and Pogba, who is poised to complete a worldrecord return from Juventus costing around 90 million pounds.

Former Italy manager Antonio Conte has been brought in to pick up the pieces at Chelsea, who recovered to finish 10th under Guus Hiddink after Mourinho's dismissal last December.

Chelsea have prised N'Golo Kante from Leicester for 30 million pounds and spent a similar amount to sign Belgium striker Michy Batshuayi from Marseille.

With no European distractions, Conte will be able to plough all his resources into steering Chelsea back into the top four. Amid the flux elsewhere, Leicester, Tottenham, Arsenal and Liverpool are trusting in the formulae that worked for them last season.

Ranieri has lost Kante, but talisman Jamie Vardy has committed to a new contract and Riyad Mahrez remains a

Leicester player. Mauricio Pochettino's young Tottenham players, among them Harry Kane and Dele Alli, now have the experience of a title race under their belts. In a show of faith to the team that challenged Leicester last season, the north London club have been content merely to add depth to their squad with the acquisitions of Victor Wanyama and Vincent Janssen.

### ARSENAL ANXIETY

Down the road at Arsenal, Arsene Wenger approaches his 20-year anniversary as manager facing the same old doubts about his capacity to inspire the team to a first league title since 2004.

Arsenal pipped Spurs to second place last season, but with Swiss midfielder Granit Xhaka the only major signing to have arrived at the Emirates Stadium and injuries already biting, fans are anxious. Liverpool, beaten finalists in the League Cup and Europa League, are looking more and more like Jurgen Klopp's team, bolstered by the acquisitions of Sadio Mane and Giorginio Wijnaldum. "We are in a good way, 100 percent," said Klopp. "And if we have a proper line-up, then we will be strong."

There are seven new managers, with Ronald Koeman succeeding the sacked Roberto Martinez at Everton and Claude Puel taking the Dutchman's place at Southampton.

David Moyes has replaced new England manager Sam Allardyce at Sunderland, while Walter Mazzarri has succeeded Quique Sanchez Flores at Watford. Hull City are without a manager after Steve Bruce resigned and having not signed a single player, they start the campaign as outright favourites for relegation. Their fellow promoted teams, Burnley and Middlesbrough, also face a battle to remain in a league that is now teeming with superstars both on the pitch and in the dug-out. "We are not naive to the challenge we face, but we are willing to take it on," said Burnley manager Sean Dyche. "The Premier League is the place to be." — AFP

# CITY SPLASH OUT ON EVERTON'S STONES

**LONDON:** Manchester City splashed out a reported £47.5 million (\$61 million, 55 million euros) to sign England defender John Stones from Everton yesterday.

Stones agreed a six-year contract with City and is reported to have become the second most expensive defender in history behind Paris Saint Germain and Brazil star

"I'm absolutely delighted to sign for City ward to the next stage in my career," Stones told City's website. "I've obviously seen what's going on here at the Etihad, it's an ambitious club with a great manager so I can't wait to get stuck in and help achieve the goals." News of Stones' imminent move to Eastlands had leaked out earlier in the day when UEFA's website included the 22year-old centre-back City's squad for next week's Champions League play-off against Steaua Bucharest. City responded by quickly announcing the deal, which puts Stones behind only Luiz as the most expensive defender the game has ever seen. Luiz moved to Paris Saint Germain from Chelsea for £50 million in 2014 and has won two successive French titles, a feat that Stones is keen to emulate with City once he is established in the team.

"I know it will be tough getting a place in this team but I'm determined to become the best player I can be and help us to success," Stones said. "I had a wonderful time with Everton and wish them and their fans all the best but now I'll give my all for City."

Stones' signing takes City manager Pep Guardiola's spending to well over £100 million since he arrived from Bayern Munich in

the close-season. Guardiola, who has also signed Ilkay Gundogan, Nolito, Leroy Sane, Gabriel Jesus and Alexander Zinchenko, believes Stones perfectly fits his philosophy of having defenders who are as good in possession as they are in the tackle. "We want to help John show his quality with us and improve on what he has already achieved," Guardiola said.

"I like the way he plays the game and I'm looking forward to welcoming him into the Stones who has won 10 England caps, had hoped to join Chelsea last year and had a transfer request rejected when the London club's bids were snubbed by Everton. But Everton have finally relented and allowed their prize asset to leave Goodison Park as City flexed their financial muscles just hours after bitter rivals Manchester United completed a world record £89 million swoop for Juventus midfielder Paul Pogba.

Stones' arrival is a huge boost for Guardiola ahead of City's Premier League opener at home to Sunderland on Saturday. Guardiola had limited options at centre-back with Vincent Kompany, Eliaquim Mangala and Nicolas Otamendi all struggling with injuries, and only the latter has been included in the Champions League squad for the Steaua clash. In City's pre-season friendlies, midfielder Fernando and left-back Aleksandar Kolarov have been shuffled into the heart of the defence, with Belgian youngster Jason Denayer, yet to make a senior appearance for City, Guardiola's only other option.

Stones should solve those issues if he can continue his impressive development after emerging as one of England's brightest young talents at Everton following a £3 million move from Barnsley in 2013. — AFP

# POGBA 'BACK HOME' AT MAN UTD IN WORLD-RECORD TRANSFER

MANCHESTER: Emerging from the shadows, Paul Pogba - a red devil emblazoned on the side of his head - removed his hood, looked straight into the camera and uttered the words Manchester United fans had been waiting to

With that 26-second video teaser released by United early Tuesday, the France midfielder became the world's most expensive footballer at around 105 million euros (\$116 million) and England's biggest club made another statement of intent during its latest offseason of heavy spending that moved close to \$200 million.

"I just went for a holiday," said Pogba, who left United at age 19 for Juventus four years ago, virtually for nothing when his first contract with the club expired. "I've come back home."

This was the new Man United at work: Breaking the world transfer record and announcing the signing after midnight local time to suit foreign audiences. A series of glitzy videos included one with a grime artist where Pogba produces some impressive dance moves.

United will hope the 23-year-old Pogba saves his best work for the football field, though. And he's certainly dreaming big in his new era for the club under Jose Mourinho.

"First of all, win the league for the first time with United because I hadn't won the league when I left," Pogba said. "The Champions League of course and, personally, one of my dreams is to win the Ballon d'Or (FIFA's world player of the year award). "That will come with time hopefully, but first the Premier League - I've never done it."

### **OVERPRICED**

Pogba said he was not bothered about the world-record price tag and that his return to United, nicknamed the Red Devils, was "destiny" and predicted by his mother.

"My mum told me I would come back here and I told her, 'You never know, you'll see," he said. "For myself as well it's a big challenge, too, just to come back to where I came from, where I grew up, where I started. I didn't finish what I started here so I think I came here to finish it."

United has missed out on some of its No. 1 transfer targets in previous offseasons - notably Gareth Bale and Cesc Fabregas in 2013 - but was determined to push this one through, even if it meant paying a fee widely regarded as overpriced. United is one of the few clubs in world football that could afford this outlay, though. And if Pogba can help the team return to the top of the English and European game after lean years since Alex Ferguson's retirement in 2013, it will be money well spent.

Mourinho's lineup for the new season is starting to have a fearsome look to it. The spine, in particular, is full of stars, winners and real potential - David de Gea, new 30-million-pound signing Eric Bailly, Pogba, Wayne Rooney, Zlatan

The front five of Ibrahimovic, Rooney, Anthony Martial, Henrikh Mkhitaryan and Pogba has plenty of goals, power and quality in it, an upgrade on what Louis van Gaal had last season.

United has finished seventh, fourth and fifth in the post-Ferguson years, but is one of the title favorites this season.

Pogba played only seven games - all as a substitute - in his first spell at United, which ended sourly when he allowed his contract to run down and joined Juventus. United got only 800,000 pounds (now around \$1 million) in compensation for a player who was then just a precocious teenager.

It is now five years since PSG were taken over by Qatar Sports Investments and they will be looking to win a fifth consecutive league crown, albeit with a new look.

Despite overseeing clean sweeps of the domestic honours in each of the last two seasons, Laurent Blanc was sacked for failing to take Paris beyond the quarter-finals of the Champions League.

Spaniard Emery was named as his replacement, arriving from Sevilla where he won the Europa League in three straight seasons. Ibrahimovic, whose contract had expired, has gone to Manchester United but there has been no megastar signing made to replace him. The new sporting director, Dutchman Patrick Kluivert, has however overseen the arrivals of Jese Rodriguez, Hatem Ben Arfa, Grzegorz Krychowiak and Thomas Meunier.

"PSG called me when I was very happy in Seville, but I think I can go a bit further yet with PSG," Emery told sports daily L'Equipe. "This club with its current owner is young. With what I have done before I should be able to help them grow."

Last season, Paris finished a ridiculous 31 points ahead of Lyon in second but there is hope for neutrals that the gap to the rest will

be just a little tighter this time.

Lyon are now settled in their spectacular new stadium and coach Bruno Genesio was rewarded for taking OL to second spot with a new three-year contract.

So far he has held on to coveted midfielder Corentin Tolisso and star striker Alexandre Lacazette. Samuel Umtiti has gone to Barcelona but Cameroon international Nicolas Nkoulou has arrived from Marseille to replace him. Lyon look well-placed to establish themselves as the best of the rest but president Jean-Michel Aulas has been busy criticising PSG for what he deems to be "killing the competition" in France.

"PSG are pursuing an excessive policy of investment that will reduce the competitiveness of our Ligue 1. Too much is too much," Aulas tweeted last week.

Monaco faded to finish third last season and will hope to improve this time while also returning to the Champions League group stage. They missed out in the play-offs last year and should history repeat itself they may be compelled to cash in on some of their best players before the transfer window shuts.

For now, Monaco have strengthened, including in attack. There, Radamel Falcao is back after two disappointing seasons on loan in England and will partner Valere Germain, who starred on loan at Nice last season, up front. —AFP

### Guardiola, Mourinho duel RESUMES IN MANCHESTER

**MANCHESTER:** They've hired the two most coveted coaches in world football. Their spending on new players this offseason has just shattered the \$300-million barrier. Their stated aim is to win the English Premier League. Make no mistake: The Manchester clubs mean business. It was clearly an affront to United and City that they ended up fighting it out for fourth place in the Premier League last season. Standards slipped, rivals stole a march, a big reaction was needed.

So United hired Jose Mourinho as coach, made a statement signing in Swedish superstar Zlatan Ibrahimovic, and has just broken the world-record transfer fee to lure France midfielder Paul Pogba for around 105 million euros (\$116 million). Forget being satisfied just making the top four:

Mourinho, a win-at-all-costs coach, is demanding the title. "I want to win," Mourinho said on being hired. "I think we can really, yes." By the time Mourinho was confirmed at United in May, City had already secured the signature of Pep Guardiola. It renews a coaching rivalry in Spain that sparked and occasionally got nasty when Mourinho was in charge of Real Madrid and Guardiola at

And Guardiola has set about bringing more youth, pace and intensity into City's squad by signing six players - including Leroy Sane, Nolito, teenage Brazilian prodigy Gabriel Jesus and Ilkay Gundogan - for around \$130 million.

This is the biggest test of Guardiola's coaching career after his trophy-laden spells with Barcelona and Bayern Munich.

"Our objective," City chief executive Ferran Soriano said, "is to get to the end of the season with chances to win everything." For the hotbed not just of English football but the world game, look no further than Manchester.

In 2012, City and United were the central figures in the most exciting end ever to a Premier League season, with the blue half winning the title on goal difference. They also finished as the top two teams the following season, this time United winning the league.

Since then, United hasn't finished higher than fourth place in a post-Alex Ferguson era characterized by questionable managerial appointments and haphazard player recruitment. City has won the league once more (in 2014), which is widely considered a poor return given the wealth and players at the disposal of a club owned by the Abu Dhabi royal family.

Mourinho and Guardiola will shake things up. They have each captured 22 major trophies and have coached the biggest names in the sport. They have an intense work ethic and are among the most ruthless managers around. They are winners, pure and simple. —AP

### GERMANY'S JUNG GOES FOR ANOTHER EVENTING GOLD

RIO DE JANEIRO: Often called the best eventing rider of all time, Germany's Michael Jung aims yesterday to repeat Olympic gold with Sam, the same horse he rode to team and individual wins in 2012.

Jung and Sam will start the final day of the multidiscipline sport in second behind Australia's Christopher Burton while Germany, the team winner in 2008 and 2012, is in fourth.

"It's not often that you get to do two Olympics on the same horse. Sam is in fantastic form," Jung, 34, told Reuters. A repeat was not always the plan, however, as Jung only turned to Sam, a 16-year-old German Sport Horse, a week before the animals were due to fly to Rio. His first and younger choice Takinou suffered an infection.

The eventing competition, one of three equestrian disciplines in the Olympics, tests riders on dressage, cross country and show jumping. In 2012 Jung became the first eventing rider to hold the Olympic, European championship and world championship titles at the same time. In May, he became the first German to win the Badminton Horse Trials in England. He also completed a consecutive triple of Burghley, Kentucky and Badminton that had been achieved previously only by Britain's Pippa Funnell in 2003. "I have a really good team around me, that makes the sport for me," he said in an interview, adding that he particularly enjoys training young horses. The last rider to repeat Olympic gold eventing medals on the same horse was New Zealand's Mark Todd with Charisma, in 1984 and 1988. Jung's horse swap was not the only change made late in the eventing competition by the defending champions.

The Germans substituted Andreas Ostholt with Julia Krajewski on the eve of competition after Ostholt's horse lost a shoe in training.

Krajewski was one of 18 riders on Monday who did not finish what was widely considered the most difficult Olympic cross-country course in recent history. Jung and Sam were one of only three pairs to escape penalties on Monday. The winner will be decided by the show jumping phase on Tuesday.

Jung told reporters Sam had been too worked up by the crowds and noise leaving the gate but settled towards the end with plenty of juice left for Tuesday's competition. "He understands every question and I'm very happy to say he is very healthy," he said at a news conference. — Reuters

# US MEN'S BASKETBALL BLASTS VENEZUELA AFTER SLOW START



### **BASKETBALL**

RIO DE JANEIRO: Red, white and blase for one quarter, the U.S. Olympic team woke up and won with ease. Shaking off a sluggish, sloppy start and maybe some Brazilian boredom, the Americans regrouped in the second guarter and romped over Venezuela 113-69 on Monday, taking another step toward a possible third straight gold medal.

Kevin Durant scored 16 points and Carmelo Anthony 14 for the US squad, which may have grown a touch overconfident following a 57-point blowout of China in its tournament opener. The Americans were tied after one quarter, but turned up their defensive intensity, outscored Venezuela 30-8 in the second period and improved to 82-1 under coach Mike Krzyzewski.

"I think once we settled down, made our adjustments to the way they were calling the

game, the way that Venezuela wanted to 25th game for the United States, provided a play the game, that second quarter we picked it up defensively and turned it around," Anthony said.

It was similar to the meeting between the teams in Chicago on July 29, when the US shot poorly and still won by 35 on their pre-Rio exhibition tour. Maybe this was a reminder that no team can be taken lightly and there is little margin for error - once the Olympic flame is ignited. "The game of basketball, everything's not going to be easy," Durant said. "We know that, even with this great team."

The Americans continue pool play on Wednesday against unbeaten Australia. The Aussies, featuring five NBA players, four of them league champions, improved to 2-0 on Monday with an impressive 95-80 win over Serbia. Australia has never won an Olympic medal in men's basketball.

### **HEAVY UNDERDOGS**

Anthony, the four-team Olympian and two-time gold medalist playing in his record

haven't had one yet. Venezuela, which doesn't have an NBA player on its roster, didn't figure to be a threat but the FIBA Americas champion wasn't intimidated by the US roster of household names. It was a different story in the second, when the Americans reeled off 13 straight points in one stretch to take control. ### US WOMEN HOLD OFF **SCRAPPY NETHERLANDS** TEAM IN 5 SETS

RIO DE JANEIRO: This past year in Istanbul, US assistant coach Jamie Morrison worked right alongside a man he considers among the best volleyball minds in the business.

And fired-up, Italian-born Netherlands coach Giovanni Guidetti is suddenly making quite a splash in Brazil with group of tenacious Dutch women determined to spoil the fun for the top teams in the tournament. Even if few might have expected them to contend while playing in their first Olympics in 20 years.

Morrison was an assistant on Guidetti's staff at club power Vakifbank in Turkey, coaching Olympians Lonneke Sloetjes, Anne Buijs and Robin de Kruijf and also US outside hitter Kim Hill, who through the net saw several familiar faces. So, when the top-ranked Americans received a real push from the Netherlands in a hard-fought, five-set victory Monday, Morrison and the rest of the US group were nowhere near surprised by the stellar display on the other side. The Dutch had already spoiled China's Olympic debut Saturday, then the Chinese bounced back with a straight-set win over Italy.

"They're not intimidated by anybody now, and they shouldn't be. They're good," said US coach Karch Kiraly, who figures the group winners won't go unscathed. "And that's great, because the Olympics are about being good."

Guidetti credits Morrison - someone he considers above an assistant - for helping him become a better coach. "I learned a lot from him and I hope I can keep learning a lot from him," Guidetti said after the match. "He's an amazing coach. He's an amazing man and he knows volleyball very well. "He's like a lead guy. I'm really trying to learn every time from the people that can teach me, and he's for sure one of the ones that can teach me."

The US rallied from one set down and again behind 2-1 to win 18-25, 25-18, 21-25, 25-20, 15-8 on a day Netherlands captain Maret Balkestein-Grothues had to be helped off midway through the fourth set with a right ankle injury and didn't return. Simple communications were made before the match.

Such close international connections are commonplace in a sport that has no professional

league in the U.S. for men or women, meaning players move across the world for eight months of the year to play professionally. "I looked across the net and we were smiling before the match," Morrison said. "A head nod, nothing more than that, not a hug."

You bet the Americans envisioned this success for the Netherlands, a squad Morrison has seen make big strides in a matter of weeks ahead of the Olympics.

"Volleyball has come enormously far in the Netherlands in the past two years," he said. "The team is up and coming and the support in their country is as well."—AP

## Daley eyes China showdown AFTER BRONZE DEBUT



### **DIVING**

**RIO DE JANEIRO:** British star Tom Daley insisted China's ruthlessly efficient divers are "beatable" Monday as he looked ahead to an enticing new clash after getting just bronze in the Olympic 10m synchronised event.

Daley and his partner Daniel Goodfellow settled for third in the tandem event, behind gold medallists Chen Aisen and Lin Yue and secondplace Americans David Boudia and Steele Johnson.

China is threatening to pull off a historic sweep of diving's eight goldmedal events in Rio. Wu Minxia and Shi Tingmao opened the competition Sunday with a decisive women's 3m synchronised springboard win. There are six to go. Daley had come to Rio challenging his Chinese adversaries, saying "they have to beat me." He offered praise for China's domi-

nance on Monday but continued to stir the pot, saying he was eager to beat Chen and 2012 silver medallist Qiu Bo in the 10m individual. Asked what makes China so strong,

he sniffed: "1.3 billion as a population helps," before catching himself and praising their work ethic.

"These guys are so strong, they're so technically proficient in what they do," he said. "But going into an individual competition, as David will be able to tell you, they are beatable."

He was referring to Boudia's upset of Qiu in the thrilling platform final in London, one of only two golds won in 2012 by non-Chinese divers. Daley took the bronze.

Daley, Boudia, and the rest of the field will have their work cut out for them in stopping the Chinese juggernaut in the 10m individual. Chen and Lin were coasting toward a dominating performance on Monday until a wobbly fourth dive-a back 3 1/2 somersault in pike position-opened the door a crack. "We had a little bit of hesitation during our jump, so we did not handle it very well," Lin said.

But they slammed the door shut on the next dive, nailing a front 4 1/2 somersault tuck that won 9.5s and 10s and set Rio's outdoor diving venue alight. Daley, still just 22 despite being in the spotlight for nearly a decade, is seeking to finally deliver the gold medal that has eluded him since emerging as a star in his mid-teens.

His Olympic debut came in Beijing 2008 when he was just 14. He finished seventh there in the 10m individual platform, before his London bronze.

The two-day men's 10m individual competition begins August 19. —AFP





# SAMBA AND SMILES AS BOLT WARMS UP FOR OLYMPIC SWANSONG

**RIO DE JANEIRO:** Shimmying amid a troupe of seminaked samba dancers and wise-cracking with journalists, Usain Bolt is determined to bow out of the Olympics with a flourish. The 29-year-old Jamaican sprint star took centre-stage on Monday at his first major press conference since arriving in Rio de Janeiro for his final Games.

And from the moment he strutted onto the stage at Rio's Cidade des Artes theater-instructing his audience to applaud-he was determined to entertain. "You've got to clap much louder than that, that was weak," Bolt joked.

The setting of the largest theater in South America could not have been more appropriate for track and field's greatest showman. "I like to entertain, because that's what people come out and see," Bolt said.

"I try to entertain and make it different. That's my personality." And it works. A Norwegian stood up at the end of the press conference and said: "I don't really have a question I just want to say I really love you man."

It was a reminder of just what athletics will lose when Bolt walks away from the sport next year after the World Championships in London. Before that however he has his final Olympics to think about, where he will bid to win 100m, 200m and 4x100m titles for a third straight Games, the fabled "Treble-Treble."

"This is the last one for sure," Bolt said when asked if he may yet extend his remarkable career. "I've done enough. I've proven myself over and over again, this is the last one." Bolt is preparing to bow out as athletics reels from two of the biggest controversies in the sport's history, the Russian doping scandal and corruption allegations against the former leadership of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF). Even so, Bolt believes athletics has turned the corner. "For me I think we're going in the right direction, I must say," Bolt said.

### 'WEEDING OUT BAD ONES'

"We're weeding out the bad ones. I personally think we're on the right track. We have to go through the rough time to get to the good times. And in a few years' time the sport will be cleaner and everything will be great. "I look forward to that."

Although the Russian doping scandal exposed the sophisticated lengths that drug cheats were prepared to go to avoid detection, Bolt said he was unconcerned about the possibility that he might be lining up against rivals in Rio who are not clean.

"In life nothing is guaranteed. But for me going out there, I never worry about it," he said.

"That's WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency) and IAAF and IOC (International Olympic Committee) — these are the guys that worry about that stuff," Bolt said. "I go out there to compete and wow the crowd and entertain. I just want to compete.

"I personally feel the sport is going in the right direction and in a few years it's going to be fine. I don't worry about that." Bolt is set to face another duel against two-time convicted doping offender Justin Gatlin in both the 100m and the 200m in Rio.

Gatlin, owner of the fastest time in the world this year (9.80 sec), could be the biggest threat to Bolt's hopes of defending all three of his crowns.

Bolt, who has long spoken of his desire to become the first man to break 19 seconds in the 200m, acknowledged that feat may prove to be beyond even him.

"I think it might be a little but hard," said Bolt, who has never bettered the world record of 19.19sec he set in 2009. Bolt, who ran 19.89sec in London last month, declares himself primed for another gold medal tilt.

"As a young kid you grow up looking forward to the big Games," he said. "Championships are what matters. This is what I do, I enjoy doing it. —AFP

# THAI DRUGS CHEAT GRABS WEIGHTLIFTING GOLD



**RIO DE JANEIRO:** Sukanya Srisurat said her Olympic gold Monday was redemption for serving a two-year-ban for doping offences as Thailand finished one-two in the women's 58kg to lead the weightlifting medals table.

The 21-year-old lifted an Olympic record 110kg in the snatch and 130kg in the clean and jerk for a total of 240kg, comfortably beating compatriot Pimsiri Sirikaew to first place. The International Weightlifting Federation banned Sukanya from the sport from May 2011 to May 2013 after she test-

ed positive as a 16-year-old for the prohibited substance methandienone, an anabolic steroid. She was one of seven young Thai weightlifters found to have violated antidoping rules during youth and junior weightlifting championships five years ago.

"I felt so sad when I was banned but I never gave up to get back and now everything has been repaid," she told AFP following her triumph in Rio. "I practised so hard. This is my first Olympic Games and I'm really delighted," she added, later insisting she'd never been at fault for the doping in the first place.

"I didn't make the decision to take it. Our association never made a decision. It was maybe some kind of mistake," she told reporters through a translator.

Twenty-six-year-old Pimsiri lifted 102kg

in the snatch and jerked 130 for her total of 232kg to add another silver medal to the one she won at London four years ago.

Pimsiri said Sukanya had paid her dues for the doping offence and insisted she was happy to finish second to the gold medallist, despite her competitor's previous drug use. "Congratulations to her. We work as a team to make Thailand happy. We're like family so it's ok for me to finish second," Pimsiri said. The two podium finishes took Thailand to the top of the weightlifting medals table with four.

The kingdom has dominated the light categories so far grabbing two golds and a silver in the women's competition and a bronze in the men's. Sopita Tanasan claimed gold in the women's 48kg on Saturday while Sinphet Kruaithong finished

with a bronze in the men's 56kg the following day. Kruaithong's joy was short-lived as his 84-year-old grandmother collapsed and died celebrating his success.

A viral video showed the jubilant scene of cheering fans in his rural hometown transform into tragedy when Subin Khongthap collapsed while watching the competition on a projector.

"We support and encourage each other to bring out the best in all of us," Sukanya said when asked about the reason for Thailand's success this week. Kuo Hsingchun claimed bronze for Taiwan with her combined total of 231.

She hauled 102 in the snatch and 129 in the clean and jerk to comfortably make the podium, 8kg ahead of fourth placed Alexandra Escobar of Ecuador. — AFP

### SERENA STRUGGLES, DEL Potro blasts punch-up

**RIO DE JANEIRO:** Defending champion Serena Williams ended a three-match losing streak against France's Alize Cornet to keep her hopes of a fifth Olympic gold medal alive Monday. But it was a rollercoaster 7-6 (7/5), 6-2 victory for the 34-year-old world number one who 24 hours earlier had suffered her first ever Olympic Games women's doubles loss with sister Venus.

Cornet defeated the American star three times in 2014, including at Wimbledon, and proved to be a thorn in her opponent's side again in Rio. Williams led 3-0 and had two points for a 4-0 advantage in the first set. But Cornet stormed back, forcing the American to save two set points in the 10th game before the top seed sealed the tiebreak after 77 minutes on a chilly centre court.

The 22-time major winner cut a frustrated figure, smashing her racquet into the ground at one stage. Williams stepped on the gas in the second set to secure a third round clash with Ukraine's Elina Svitolina, securing victory on a third match point. "It was a big motivation to win because I haven't done very well against her in the past," said Williams.

past," said Williams.

"She says she knows how to play me. Every time I have played her, I have never been in the best shape which is ironic, so I really wanted to do well." Juan Martin del Potro followed up his shock defeat of Novak Djokovic by downing Portugal's Joao Sousa in front of a legion of passionate, vocal Argentine fans. The giant 27-year-old, ranked 141 in the world after years of wrist injury misery pushed him to the brink of quitting, swept to a 6-3, 1-6, 6-3 win. Dressed in sky blue football shirts, the Argentine's followers draped national flags and banners over the centre court barriers and responded defiantly when locals booed the mention of del Potro's name.

### PUNCH-UP

However, traditional bitterness between Brazil and Argentina boiled over when a group of fans engaged in a punch-up. "I hope that will not happen again because we need to have peace between Argentina and Brazil. This is not football," said del Potro. The 2009 US Open champion said he was running on empty by the end after only getting to bed at 4:30 in the morning.

"I only had five hours' sleep but I'm very glad with my success," he said. Things got even better for Del Potro when French fifth seed Jo-Wilfried Tsonga, a potential quarter-final opponent, lost 6-4, 6-3 to Gilles Muller of Luxemburg.—AFP

# CHINESE REELING AFTER LOSS OF 'PRECIOUS' GYMNASTICS TEAM CROWN



### **GYMNASTICS**

**RIO DE JANEIRO:** Zhang Chenglong insisted China are not a spent force after Kohei Uchimura's Japan ended their eight-year Olympic men's team reign in Rio. The Chinese finished with bronze less than a year after also losing the world title they had won six consecutive times, and all but once since 1994, to Japan.

Uchimura, 27, helped Japan to their first team gold since 2004 in the Rio Olympic Arena ahead of Russia, who were back on the podium for the first time since 2000. There was despair on the Chinese team with Zhang admitting the importance of the title to the Asian giant. "Every one of us thinks that team gold is the most important and precious, you have to be solid and united," said Zhang.

"In China team work is very important. "You can't just stay in your own corner and do your own thing. Everyone has to be excellent not just one person."

"Team gold represents the summit of Chinese gymnastics. It's not down to one person to be excellent, but everyone has to be excellent."

China paid for errors starting with a shaky start for Lin Chaopan, 20, and Deng Shudi, 24, on the floor as they competed alongside the United States. You also struggled on his rings dismount.

The Chinese impressed on the parallel bars with You hitting 16.166, but they needed a strong final rotation on the high bar to keep in the title chase.

Deng, Lin, and Zhang failed to produce the necessary fireworks, finishing nearly three points behind Japan. It was also the end of the road for Zhang, a gold medal winner in the team event from London, and seven-time world medallist over four world championships.

The 27-year-old has failed to reach the finals of the all-around and apparatus events.

Deng and Lin qualified for Wednesday's all-around final, in fourth and tenth position.

In the apparatus events Chinese hopes lie with Liu Yang and You Hao on rings with Hao a medal prospect on parallel bars with Deng.

China took the men's team gold for the first time in Syndey 2000, only to lose to Japan in Athens four years later. But they recaptured it at their home Games in Beijing 2008 and successfully defended it in London. And they are already learning from their

rivals. "We were paying attention to the other athletes and their training and are learning new techniques, not just focusing on ourselves.

"We recognise that compared to the other teams there is a very small difference. "In this competition Japan has been performing very well. Japan have been improving in technique, compared to last year even they were better. —AFP

# KING BEATS TAINTED RUSSIAN SWIMMER TO GOLD



### SWIMMING

RIO DE JANEIRO: Doping tensions in Olympic swimming erupted after American Lilly King beat tainted Russian rival Yulia Efimova and US superstar Michael Phelps demanded life bans for swimmers with a drug record. Booing broke out in the swimming arena on Monday as Efimova-twice convicted of doping but securing an Olympic place on a last-ditch appeal-lined up to challenge the women's 100m breaststroke final. King narrowly beat her then slammed her rival, stoking the controversy over revelations of Russian stated-sponsored doping.

"I think it just proved that you can compete clean and still come out on top," King said of her win. She had also criticized Efimova before the race. Clearly devastated, Efimova burst into tears after the race. Russia sprang to her defense, with Sports Minister Vitaly Mutko describing her as a "good girl", according Moscow's R-Sport news agency. The attacks were described as a "ter-

rible ordeal."

The red-faced International Olympic Committee (IOC) sought to calm the choppy waters, saying the Games were about "respecting the right of others to compete"

But King was joined in the war of words by US legend Phelps and Frenchman Camille Lacourt among others who lashed out at a Chinese winner. Phelps, who will attempt the astonishing feat of winning his 20th Olympic gold medal later yesterday, launched a broadside at drug abusers and encouraged others to speak out.

Phelps said those punished for doping should face permanent exile from the sport. "I think you're going to see a lot of people speaking up more," the all-time highest Olympic medal winner said. China's Sun Yang, who won the 200m freestyle on Monday, came under fierce attack from a furious Lacourt.

"Sun Yang, he pisses purple," an enraged Lacourt who came fifth in the 100m backstroke told French radio. "When I see the 200m podium I want to be sick." Sun has already been at the center of a verbal battle with Australia's Mack Horton who beat Sun in the 400m race.

The Sun-Horton dispute has turned into a social media war. China's state-controlled Global Times newspaper called Australia a former British "offshore prison" because of Horton's "drug cheat" remarks about Sun.

### THREE BANS

Efimova sought to defend her doping record. "I once made a mistake and served my ban," she said, referring to a 16-month suspension incurred after testing positive for a banned steroid in 2014.

She was given a provisional ban this year after testing positive for meldonium but that was overturned in May by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS).

Following the Richard McLaren report for the World Anti-Doping Agency, Efimova was suspended again. The report implicated the Russian government in doping. But another appeal to the CAS last week let Efimova and six other Russian swimmers into Rio. The United States and other western countries had wanted a complete ban on Russian athletes.

The row largely overshadowed a day that saw a first gold medal for the Brazilian hosts. It was won by judoka Rafaela Silva, who grew up in Rio's notorious City of God slum. Silva upset world No. 1 Sumiya Dorjsuren in the 57kg final for a hugely welcome win for Brazil after apathy and protests in the run-up to South America's first Olympics.

China got more medals in diving, where Chen Aisen and Lin Yue won the men's 10m platform. China finished the day with five gold medals in total. Russia took gold and silver in the women's sabre fencing as Yana Egorian beat Sofiya Velikaya, who again suffered heartbreak after also losing the 2012 Olympic final. — AFP

# AUSTRALIA CLINCH WOMEN'S SEVENS GOLD



### RUGBY

RIO DE JANEIRO: Australia became the first Olympic champions in women's rugby sevens when they ran out convincing 24-17 winners over trans-Tasman neighbours New Zealand in the gold medal final at the Deodoro Stadium in Rio on Monday.

The world series champions went behind early in the match but unanswered tries from Emma Tonegato, Evania Pelite, Ellia Green and Charlotte Caslick gave them a lead New Zealand were unable to overcome.

New Zealand, who had two tries from the outstanding Kayla McAlister and one at the death from Portia Woodman, performed a tearful haka in front of the crowd at the end of the match, their dreams of gold shattered.

It was the spell that Woodman, the top try scorer in the tournament with 10, spent in the sin-bin for a deliberate knock down around halftime that probably ended

those hopes.

Without question the best two of the 12

teams in the tournament, both New Zealand and Australia had come through scares at the hands of the United States on Sunday to stamp their authority on the semi-finals.

After a tight and physical start to the final, McAlister forced her way over in the corner for her sixth try of the tournament to give New Zealand an early lead before Tonegato hit back with her seventh.

Australia had started to find holes in the New Zealand defence and when Woodman was sent off for two minutes, first Pelite then speedster Green benefited from the extra space to give the women in green and gold a 17-5 lead just after halftime.

Charlotte Caslick then nipped over for another converted try to further extend Australia's lead and although McAlister grabbed her second try, two converted scores for New Zealand in little more than a minute was always going to be a big ask.

Woodman did finally weave her way over to score under the posts but the hooter had sounded and Australia were already well into their celebrations when Tyla Nathan-Wong took the conversion.

Canada earlier took the bronze with a 33-10 victory over Britain. — Reuters

# IRON LADY IN 'GREAT SHAPE' AS SHE SNARES SECOND GOLD



### SWIMMING

RIO DE JANEIRO: Hungary's Katinka Hosszu said she felt in "great shape" on Monday as she powered to her second gold medal of the Rio Olympics-and stayed on track for three more. Hosszu, dubbed the "Iron Lady" for her renowned stamina, won the 100m backstroke in 58.45sec, ahead of American Kathleen Baker, as Canadian Kylie Masse and China's Fu Yuanhui finished in a dead heat for bronze. Hosszu, who returned little more than an hour later to book her spot in Tuesday's 200m medley final, said she wasn't feeling any pressure from her heavy schedule, which also includes the 200m backstroke and 200m butterfly. On Saturday, the 27-year-old shattered the 400m individual medley world record for her first ever Olympic title.

"I was already very relaxed before the 400IM which was surprising for me," said Hosszu, who arrived in Rio in search of her first Olympic medal. "I have been racing so much in the past four years that that was kind of my goal that when we get to Rio it would kind of be second nature and it really feels that way.

"I know I've done the 400IM and the 100 back a million times and now I'm fresh and in great shape," she added. Hosszu was sixth at the turn with world champion Emily Seebohm of Australia leading. She roared home as Seebohm failed not only to improve on the silver she won in London but faded to finish a disappointing seventh. "I can't believe I won the 100 back," Hosszu said. "I dreamt about it, but I could have done eighth, it's so close."

Seebohm, swimming in unfavorable lane seven after a lackluster semi-final performance, was left looking for answers after coming into the Games with the top time of 2016. "I definitely wanted to take it out (fast) and obviously it hurt a bit on the back end," she said. "I did a fantastic warm-up. I couldn't have done anything differently. "My semi needed to be better so I could be in an inside land and have someone to push me," she concluded. — AFP

# Delta cancels 300 flights after outage

## AIRLINE SEEKS FORGIVENESS WITH REFUNDS, VOUCHERS

**DALLAS:** Delta's travails, and those of its customers, move into day two with the airline canceling of another 300 flights. The disruptions yesterday follow about 1,000 cancelled flights Monday and, according to FlightStats, about 2,800 delayed flights, after an outage at Delta's Atlanta headquarters instigated a global meltdown of its booking and communications systems.

The airline was back online after a number of hours Monday, but the outages were so widespread that it is still dealing with the ripple effects a day later. Flight Stats, a flight tracking services, puts delayed flights Tuesday at close to 600, and cancelled flights closer to 330. More than 1,000 people spent the night at Narita airport outside Tokyo because of the shutdown and, while flights were resuming yesterday, Delta spokeswoman Hiroko Okada said more delays are expected. Delta also extended to yesterday travel waivers issued to the stranded.

### Apology

The airline posted a video apology by CEO Ed Bastian. And it offered refunds and \$200 in travel vouchers to people whose flights were canceled or delayed at least three hours. Delta's challenge will be to find enough seats on planes during the busy summer vacation season to accommodate the tens of thousands of passengers whose flights were scrubbed. Airlines have been putting more people in each plane, so when a system of a major carrier crashes, as has happened with others before Delta, finding a new seat for the waylaid becomes more difficult.

Last month, the average Delta flight was 87 percent full. Confusion among passengers Monday was compounded as Delta's flight-status updates crashed as well. Instead of staying home or poolside at a hotel until the troubles blew over, many passengers only learned about the quagmire only after they passed through airport security.

They were stuck. The disruption was so deeply rooted Monday that at one point, the airline warned travelers that information on its website, its app, and even given by its own employees in airports, may be outdated.

"By the time I showed up at the gate the employees were already disgruntled, and it was really difficult to get anybody to speak to me or get any information," said Ashley Roache, whose flight from Lexington, Kentucky, to New York's LaGuardia Airport was delayed. "The company could have done a better job of explaining ... what was happening."

### Investigation

Delta spokesman Trebor Banstetter said that after the power outage, key systems and network equipment did not switch over to backups. The investigation of the outage is ongoing, but Banstetter said that there is no indication that the problems were caused by a hack or intentional breach of the system.

Georgia Power, which controls the system where the outage began, said it appears that a failure of Delta equipment caused the airline's power disruption. No other customers lost power, a spokesman said. Delta Air Lines Inc. is the third-largest in the world by number of passengers carried, with 138.8 million travelers last year, according to industry group IATA, but it ranks just behind American Airlines and Southwest Airlines.

Airlines depend on huge, overlapping and complicated systems to operate flights, ticketing, boarding, airport kiosks, websites and mobile phone apps. Even brief outages can now snarl traffic and, as the Delta incident shows, those problems can go global in seconds. Last month, Southwest Airlines canceled more than 2,000 flights over four days after an outage that it blamed on a faulty network router. United Airlines suffered a series of massive IT meltdowns after combining its technology systems with those of merger partner Continental Airlines.

Lines for British Airways at some airports have grown longer as the carrier updates its systems. Delta employees were forced into something of a time machine as they did their best to get people to where they were going. Agents at many airports were using pen and paper to create boarding passes. In Tokyo, a dot-matrix printer was resurrected to keep track of passengers on a flight to

Some passengers said they were shocked that computer glitches could cause such turmoil. Others took it in stride. Ryan Shannon, another passenger on the Lexington-to-New York flight, said passengers boarded, were asked to exit, waited about 90 minutes and then got back on the plane. Once Delta cleared flights to take off, "we boarded and didn't have any problems. There is always a delay, or weather, or something. I travel weekly, so I'm used to it," Shannon said.—AP

# US PRODUCTIVITY FALLS FOR THIRD QUARTER IN A ROW

**WASHINGTON:** US nonfarm productivity unexpectedly fell in the second quarter, pointing to sustained weakness that could raise concerns about corporate profits and companies' ability to maintain their recent robust pace of hiring.

The Labor Department said yesterday that productivity, which measures hourly output per worker, dropped at a 0.5 percent annual rate in the April-June period. It was the third consecutive quarterly decline. "The reason the economy has still been able to expand is because of labor input. Firms are hiring people at a reasonably healthy rate," said Joseph LaVorgna, chief economist at Deutsche Bank Securities in New York.

"However, we do not believe this can last, because strong hiring in the face of weak productivity necessarily implies a further deterioration in corporate profit

Productivity fell at an unrevised 0.6 percent rate in the first quarter. Economists polled by Reuters had forecast productivity rising at a 0.4 percent rate in the second quarter.

The US dollar weakened to session lows against the yen after the data. US stock futures and prices of US Treasuries were largely unchanged. Productivity decreased at a 0.4 percent rate compared to the second quarter of 2015, the fastest year-onyear pace of decline in three years. Revisions to data going back to 2013 also confirmed the softening productivity trend, which over time would suggest pressure on corporate profits and a slowdown in job gains. Strong employment gains have helped

to raise output. Nonfarm payrolls increased by more than 500,000 jobs in

### **SLUGGISH CORPORATE PROFITS**

Corporate profits have been sluggish, in part as companies deal with the lagging impact of a strong dollar and lower oil prices. After-tax profits rebounded at an 8.1 percent rate in the first quarter after declining 5.3 percent in 2015. Corporate profits data for the second quarter will be published later this month. Output per worker in the second quarter increased at a 1.2 percent rate, up from the 0.7 percent pace notched in the January-March period.

The government reported last month that gross domestic product rose at a 1.2 percent annual rate in the second quarter following a 0.8 percent rise in the first quarter. Some economists have attributed the weak productivity to the changing industry mix, which has seen a shift from manufacturing and energy toward services. Others have questioned whether it is being accurately measured.

Productivity has increased at an annual rate of less than 1.0 percent in each of the last five years, suggesting the economy's potential rate of growth has declined.

Unit labor costs, the price of labor per single unit of output, increased at a 2.0 percent pace in the second quarter. Firstquarter unit labor costs were revised to show a 0.2 percent rate of decrease, instead of the previously reported 4.5 percent increase. Second-quarter unit labor costs rose at a 2.1 percent rate compared to the same period of 2015.

Hourly compensation per hour rose at a 1.5 percent rate in the second quarter after falling at a 0.8 percent pace in the prior quarter. — Reuters

## QATAR SNAPS 3-DAY WINNING STREAK, SAUDI FIRMS WITH OIL

### **MIDEAST STOCK MARKETS**

**DUBAI:** Qatar's stock market index ended a three-day winning streak yesterday as local investors booked profits while Saudi Arabia's index rose, helped by firmer oil prices. Doha's index, which had climbed as much as 0.7 percent earlier in the day, slipped in the final hour of trade to close 0.02 percent lower. It hit a nine-month closing high on Monday.

Shares on the MSCI emerging market index turned south, with Islamic lender Masraf Al-Rayan dropping 2.1 percent and Qatar Islamic Bank falling 2.6 percent. Sebastien Henin, head of asset management at Abu Dhabi's The National Investor, said passive inflows from emerging market funds had driven up prices over the last several weeks and traders might choose to book profits at current levels, keeping the market locked in a narrow trading range in the short term.

In Abu Dhabi the index edged down 0.3 percent as some shares on MSCI's emerging market index retreated. First Gulf Bank dropped 1.3 percent. Dubai's index held onto gains and added 0.3 percent, boosted by advances in blue chips. Emaar Properties rose 0.9 percent and Dubai Investments climbed 1.4 percent.

Shuaa Capital gained 3.1 percent in its highest volumes in two months on news the Nasdag Dubai exchange will open an equity futures market next month. The market will trade single-stock futures on the shares of some of the United Arab Emirates' biggest companies, with Shuaa providing market-making services. This could expand the firm's revenues.

### **SAUDI ARABIA, EGYPT**

Petrochemical shares pulled Saudi Arabia's index up 1 percent after Brent oil futures climbed back above \$45 a barrel. Saudi Basic Industries gained 3.1 percent. Banking shares also fared well, with Samba Financial Group advancing 2.4 percent.

In Egypt, the main index retreated 0.9 percent, dropping below a 13-month high hit on Monday as non-Egyptian investors sold, bourse data showed. Losers outnumbered gainers 16 to 12 with Palm Hills Development dropping 3.4 percent after it posted second-quarter net profit of 64 million Egyptian pounds (\$7.2 million), an 85 percent drop from a year earlier. The company said the main reason for the fall was a change in revenue recognition on its income statements.


Analysts at Naeem Brokerage said in a note that although profit fell short of their expectation of 119 million pounds for the April-June period, they remained positive on the stock with a "buy" rating.

"PHDC's performance at the top line seems resilient, as the company continues to capitalize on underlying growth in demand from the Egyptian real estate market," Naeem said. Real estate investment firm Porto Group jumped 10.7 percent in heavy trade and telecom conglomerate Orascom Telecom Media and Technology bounced 6.9 percent. — Reuters

# OIL MARKET TURNS BEARISH ON SUPPLY GAINS AND STOCK BUILDS

OPEC OUTPUT SURGES TO 32.8 MB/D IN JUNE

### **NBK ECONOMIC REPORT**



**KUWAIT:** A month is a long time in the oil markets. Since hitting a year-high of \$52.5 per barrel (bbl) in June, Brent crude, the international benchmark, fell by almost 20 percent during July. By 2 August, markets had entered bear territory, with Brent breaching the 20 percent decline level from its June high to \$41.8/bbl and West Texas Intermediate (WTI), the US crude marker, falling by almost 23 percent from its June high to \$39.5/bbl. The recent trend bears a striking resemblance to the behavior of the oil markets last summer when prices fell by 21 percent from their June highs over the same period. That drop, of course, marked the commencement of a downturn that would continue for the remainder of the year.

In the futures markets, hedge funds turned noticeably less bullish in July. 56 million barrels of short positions were added in Brent and WTI futures in the week ending 26 July. Indeed, shorts in Brent futures are at their highest since the start of the year. The forward price curve for Brent crude over the next 12 months has moved downwards by \$6-8/bbl during July.

### Supply glut

Once again, concerns about the persisting supply glut are weighing on market sentiment. Having seemingly recovered from the shock of 'Brexit' in late June, markets have had to digest several data releases indicating that the much anticipated rebalancing of supply and demand that was expected before year-end would be delayed until 2017. Dominating traders' thoughts is the return to the market of previously disrupted supplies, from Canada, Kuwait and Nigeria, for example, that had helped to offset increasing supplies from Iran-the largest source of output growth in 2016.

Similarly eye-catching has been the recent performance of US shale production, which posted output gains in four of the last five weeks after enduring a year's worth of declines. The resumption of US oil drilling, as evidenced by the upturn in rig counts since May, has neatly coincided with the increase in US crude output. The rise in oil prices since February, coupled with efficiency gains in shale oil extraction, has rendered the whole production process far more cost effective than even a year ago.

Moreover, with demand from refiners slipping from the robust levels of recent months, crude inventories have accumulated further. OECD commercial crude and refined product stock figures for May from the International Energy Agency (IEA) show stocks topping 3 billion barrels, a historical high, for the seventh month in a row. (Chart 3.) The rate of increase, at 5.8 percent year-on-year (y/y), however, is noticeably slower than the double-digit increases of late 2015 and early 2016.

A strengthening US dollar was also a factor in oil's decline since June. The US dollar index is up 6 percent since May. A stronger dollar renders oil, which is priced in dollars, more costly for importers using currencies not linked to the dollar.

### **Surplus narrows**

Oil surplus narrowed in 2Q16, but market balance pushed further into 2017 on slowing demand growth and rebounding non-OPEC supply.

Global oil demand and supply have, nevertheless, moved closer to equilibrium. According to the IEA, the excess of supply over demand fell to a mere 100,000 barrels per day (b/d) in 2Q16. Considering that the surplus was 2.2 mb/d in the same period last year, this is a significant unwinding.


The IEA expects global oil demand to grow by an average of 1.4 mb/d in 2016 to 96.1 mb/d before slowing to 1.2 mb/d in 2017. India's oil demand is expected to be the world's most rapidly growing in 2017, followed by China.


On the supply side, the IEA has left its forecast for non-OPEC supply growth in 2016 largely unchanged from its previous report. For 2016, the agency has supply contracting by 0.9 mb/d to 56.5 mb/d. For 2017, supply is expected to rise slightly by 0.2 mb/d. OPEC output surges in June after the return of previously disrupted supplies OPEC output rose by 476,000 b/d to 32.8 mb/d in June, according to OPEC secondary source data. While Gabon's re-admission to OPEC accounted for just under half of that increase (214,000 b/d), Nigeria, Iran, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Kuwait all turned on the taps to bring additional volumes of crude to the mar-


Nigeria's output climbed by 97,000 b/d in June to 1.5 mb/d after repairs and fewer militant attacks allowed for a partial recovery of the country's oil production from near 30-year lows. (Chart 7.) In Saudi Arabia, the onset of the hot summer season saw crude output increase by 66,000 b/d to meet increased demand for air conditioning.


### **Kuwait output**

Kuwait's crude output reached 2.8 mb/d in June-its highest level in almost two years-after the country pumped an additional 40,000 b/d. Kuwait also signed enhanced technical service agreements (ETSAs) with BP and Shell to continue optimizing production at its oilfields.









Iran, meanwhile, continued to chase its production capacity target of 4 mb/d, ramping up output by 77,000 b/d in June to 3.6 mb/d. Iran's determination to regain lost market share has seen its exports double since sanctions were lifted in January. The Islamic Republic is hoping to attract at least \$70 billion worth of investment to develop its oil industry under a new Iran Petroleum Contract (IPC).

## OIL TRADES NEAR \$45 AS **GLUT OVERSHADOWS HOPE**

**LONDON:** Oil traded around \$45 a barrel yesterday as concern about a supply glut countered forecasts for a drop in US inventories and speculation of producer action to prop up prices.

Total US crude inventories were expected to fall by 1 million barrels in weekly reports, although market intelligence firm Genscape has reported a rise of more than 307,000 barrels at the Cushing, Oklahoma US crude delivery hub, traders said. Brent crude for October was down 29 cents at \$45.10 a barrel by 1252 GMT, after rising \$1.12 on Monday. The global benchmark fell nearly 15 percent in July. US crude for

"One can only wonder how long this enthusiasm will last considering the oversupplied fundamental backdrop," said Tamas Varga of oil broker PVM. "Current oil price strength does not feel justified." OPEC comments helped fuel the gain on Monday. Its president Qatar, in a rare statement issued by the group's Vienna headquarters, said the market was on the path to rebalancing and the drop in prices would be temporary.

September was down 17 cents at \$42.85.

OPEC sources have been saying since June that renewed talks about a global output freeze could take place in September, when most members, plus non-members such as Russia, are expected to attend an International Energy Forum meeting in Algeria. The oil minister for cash-strapped Venezuela sought to keep alive the prospect of producer action to boost prices, saying on Monday a meeting between OPEC and non-OPEC countries may take place "in the coming weeks".

But Russia said it does not see grounds for new talks with OPEC yet. Iran, which refused to join an initiative discussed earlier this year to freeze output levels, has not said whether it would cooperate with any new effort. Some analysts are skeptical any producer action will result, just as the earlier attempt at an output freeze collapsed in April, scuppered by tension between Saudi Arabia and Iran.

"The discussions are likely to prove to be nothing but empty talk, with OPEC sticking with its policy of defending its market share," said Eugen Weinberg, analyst at Commerzbank.

Later yesterday, the latest round of US inventory reports will be in focus. Analysts in a Reuters poll forecast that US crude stockpiles fell by 1 million barrels last week. The American Petroleum Institute, an industry group, is due to release its inventory update at 2030 GMT, ahead of the government's report today. —Reuters

### OIL SHORT-SELLING CYCLE MAY BE AT OR NEAR TURNING POINT

**LONDON:** The enormous concentration of bearish short positions in US crude oil futures and options contracts by hedge funds and other money managers left the market ripe for a short-covering rally. The rebound in futures prices, with the September WTI contract up by 10 percent since Aug 2, has all the characteristics of a short-covering rally ("Hedge fund short covering probably accounts for oil rally", Reuters, Aug 8).

Price moves in the next few trading sessions should give some indication about whether hedge funds have embarked on the liquidation phase of the shorting cycle or are extending their short positions even further. By Aug 2, the most recent data available, hedge funds and other money managers had accumulated short positions equivalent to 248 million barrels in the main futures and options contracts linked to WTI. The number of short positions had increased from a recent low of just 71 million barrels on May 31, according to an analysis of data published by the US Commodity **Futures Trading Commission.** 

The accumulation of an additional 178 million barrels of short positions coincided with a decline in WTI futures prices of just over \$10 per barrel from \$49.93 to \$39.51. CFTC data shows there have been three previous cycles of short-selling by hedge funds since the start of 2015 and they now appear to be well into a fourth.

The accumulation and then liquidation of short positions during each cycle on NYMEX has corresponded roughly with the fall and then rise in WTI prices. The current short-selling already appeared fairly mature by Aug 2 which raised the prospect of an imminent turn-

During the three previous cycles,

hedge funds had amassed their maximum short position after 11 weeks, 13 weeks and 13 weeks, respectively. The current short-selling cycle is already nine weeks old.

In the three previous cycles, hedge fund short positions in NYMEX WTI peaked at 178 million barrels, 163 million and 201 million. The current short position has already exceeded these and hit 219 million barrels. The current cycle of short-selling is still less mature than previous cycles when they hit their turning point and switched from accumulation to liquidation of short positions.

### **Short position**

But it has also been more aggressive with a record short position in NYMEX WTI established at a much faster pace than during the previous cycles. As the number of short positions has increased in the fourth cycle, WTI prices have declined, falling at much the same rate as seen during the second and third cycles. Prices might have been expected to fall even further and even faster, given the accompanying rapid accumulation of a record short position.

The persistence of many hedge funds with long positions probably explains why prices have been stronger than during previous cycles when a roughly similar number of short positions has been established.

From a price perspective, the current cycle of short selling appears less mature than previous cycles, which would suggest it could have another 2-4 weeks before peaking. But the current cycle appears to have developed on an accelerated timetable compared with prior cycles so it may already have reached or be very near its turning point. —Reuters

# INDIA OUTGOING BANK CHIEF REBUTS CRITICS, HOLDS RATES

**MUMBAI:** India's outgoing central bank chief insisted he had laid the foundations for sustainable growth in the world's best-performing major economy after keeping interest rates on hold in his final policy review yesterday.

Raghuram Rajan, who caught the government off guard in June by announcing he was stepping down in September, said he was unfazed by his critics and that the only thing that mattered was the impact of his decisions. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor was speaking to reporters after announcing the outcome of the last monthly policy review before he returns to academia next month. After confirming that he was keeping rates on hold to check inflation, Rajan staunchly defended his time in office during which he has faced severe criticism from allies of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. "I think snap judgments either by critics or by supporters aren't really what matters," Rajan, who is a former International Monetary Fund (IMF) chief economist, told reporters in Mumbai.

"What matters is how this plays out in the longer run for stronger and sustainable growth for the country, for job creation, for our movement into the middle income.

"In our view, the measures we have taken in the RBI were and are justified given the conditions that we have. People can have different judgements."

Since Rajan's appointment in 2013 under the previous centre-left government, India has enjoyed growth rates that have eclipsed other major economies. India's economy expanded by 7.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2015-16, the fastest of any major economy, while inflation has fallen from

double-digit levels to under six percent on his watch. But although interest rates are at their lowest level since 2011, there have been tensions with the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) which has been pushing for deeper cuts, saying these would boost growth further. The BJP lawmaker Subramanian Swamy called Rajan an idiot earlier this year and told him to "go back to Chicago" where he used to be a finance professor.

Most economists however have lamented the prospect of the departure of the man who famously predicted the 2008 global financial crisis.

Rajan had been widely expected to hold the benchmark repo rate-the level at which it lends to commercial banks-at 6.50 percent yesterday. The bank last cut rates by 25 basis points in April.

'Hawkish approach'

In his address to the media, Rajan said he was confident there would be further falls in inflation after the level inched upwards to 5.77 percent in June, but warned that risks remained.

"Until we see the full effects of the monsoon, it would be premature to declare victory," he said.

The monsoon currently sweeping India has brought relief to farmers who rely on the rains for their crops, but food prices are still high in rural areas where millions of poor have been hit by a crippling drought. Some experts believe the central bank can cut rates in the next monetary policy announcement in October after a new governor is appointed. The government is yet to announce Rajan's successor with current RBI deputy governor Urjit Patel reportedly on the shortlist, along with economist Subir Gokarn, who served as RBI deputy from 2009 to 2012. Rajan took the RBI reins in September 2013 at a time when India's economy was struggling with a ballooning current account deficit, a plummeting currency and decade-low economic growth.

Many economists have hailed his line on rate cuts for bringing down India's inflation. "Overall, Rajan followed a hawkish approach to rate cuts between 2013-2014 and eased it out in the later stages. He has been very accommodative during his tenure and did what was good for the economy," Arun Singh, economist at Dun and Bradstreet, told AFP. The government last week formally adopted Rajan's consumer price inflation policy of four percent in a bid to help moderate future price rises. — AFP

# INDIA RIDE-HAILING FIRM OLA SIDESWIPED AS UBER, DIDI TEAM UP IN CHINA

**NEW DELHI:** Didi Chuxing's acquisition of Uber's China business last week reshapes the landscape in Asia's growing ride-hailing sector, and leaves India's Ola more vulnerable to attack by Uber in its \$12 billion home market. Four months ago, Ola executives met with Didi hoping the Chinese firm would invest fresh capital to help it fight Uber Technologies Inc which, with its deeper pockets, has made rapid inroads into India.

They were told Didi wanted first to sort out its own challenges in China, said a person with direct knowledge of Ola's plans. Didi and Uber have raised and spent billions of dollars in a discount slugfest to win drivers, passengers and market share in China.

Didi, now worth around \$35 billion, last year invested about \$30 million in Ola, which is also backed by Japan's SoftBank Group, and the two are allies in an anti-Uber group that also includes U.S.-based Lyft and Southeast Asia-focused Grab.

"This (Didi/Uber China) deal changes the dynamics of how they (Didi) will invest in India," said the person, who didn't want to be named because the discussions were private. If Didi invests more in Ola, it's effectively betting against Uber, its new partner in China, the person said. It's not clear whether Didi would provide equity or debt to Ola, which has raised around \$1.3 billion in funding and is valued at over \$5 billion. SoftBank Capital, Ola's key investor,

faces its own financial issues and is selling assets to raise cash and reduce debt, which may pose another fundraising challenge for Ola, which was aiming to raise another \$1 billion this year. Ola did not respond to an email request for comment. Didi said in an email that it will focus in the coming months on "ensuring smooth integration internally." It did not comment on its meeting with Ola. Didi has no immediate overseas investment plans, said a person with direct knowledge of the matter. The stakes are high in India, already one of the world's fastest growing taxi markets. Ola and Uber have burned through investors' money and clashed in legal battles over alleged dirty-tricks tactics and pricing. After the Didi deal, Uber is even more focused on India, which it has previously called its No. 2 priority overseas market, doubling down on resources, staffing and technology deployed there, said two people familiar with Uber's plans, one of whom is based in the United States.

### MISSION INDIA

Ola, founded by two graduates from India's premier technology institute, commands half of the country's taxi market as of end-June in terms of the number of cars registered on its platform, according to Counterpoint Research, with Uber on around 30 percent market share, and catching fast.

Uber has previously launched a bike taxi and autos service in India - a sign that it wants to localize transport options and a lesson from China where it focused on privately-owned cars in big cities, where car ownership has historically been low. Uber declined to comment for this article. In February, Uber opened an engineering centre in Bengaluru and has, according to LinkedIn, brought in ex-Google executive Apurva Dalal to lead its India product build. It has also hired more than three dozen engineers in India in six months and plans to add dozens more by the end of the year, said one of the people familiar with Uber's plans.

Two executives heading Uber's mapping efforts, Brian McClendon and Manik Gupta, visited India in June to work on making the Uber app more localised and boosting the mapping capabilities, the other, US-based, individual said. While Uber has pushed into cities and markets worldwide, Ola operates only in its home market. Ola is in 102 cities versus Uber's 27, according to Counterpoint, and offers a wider range of products - from auto rickshaws to shuttle buses, as well as taxi rides.

The Didi/Uber deal "will put Ola in a corner, and the pressure will rise," said Neil Shah, research director at Counterpoint. "The money Ola has will not last forever and it will require a lot of funding with Uber gaining financial strength." — Reuters

# CHINA'S PRODUCER DEFLATION EASES

**BEIJING:** China's producer prices fell at their slowest rate in nearly two years in July, the government said yesterday, a sign of improving conditions in the

world's second largest economy.

The producer price index (PPI), which measures the cost of goods at the factory gate, fell 1.7 percent year-on-year last month, the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) said, as a rebound in some commodity prices reduced downward pressures. Protracted declines in the PPI bode ill for industrial prospects and economic growth, as they put off customers-who seek to delay purchases in anticipation of cheaper deals in future-starving companies of business and

more than four years but narrowing declines in the last three months have fuelled hopes the country-a key driver of the world economy-could be reaching the bottom of a painful slowdown. The drop was less than the 2.0 percent decline forecast by economists in a Bloomberg News survey, and sharply narrower than the 2.6 percent decline in June.

The improvement in PPI "should benefit the corporate sector's profitability" researchers with ANZ said in a note. But it will mainly help state-owned enterprises, which dominate heavy industry, they added, so that the impact on pri-

vate sector investment will be limited. Producer price inflation should continue to strengthen and will "turn positive" in the second half of 2016 as commodity prices stabilize, they said.

But they warned that until Beijing's plans to cut coal and steel capacity have "made significant progress, the PPI should not stay strong".

Producer prices were helped by steady demand and "lower capacity utilisation" in factories, analysts with CICC Macro noted, adding that "higher PPI indicates continued improvement" in

manufacturers' profitability this year.

China's GDP expanded last year at its slowest rate in a quarter of a century as

Beijing strives to effect a difficult transition in its growth model away from reliance on exports and fixed-asset investment towards one driven by consumers. Consumer inflation eased slightly in July, Tuesday's data showed. The consumer price index (CPI) — a main gauge of inflation-rose 1.8 percent onyear, the NBS said, lower than June's 1.9 percent rise but matching expectations in a Bloomberg survey.

Moderate inflation can be a boon to consumption as it pushes buyers to act before prices go up. Beijing is targeting consumer inflation of around 3 percent this year. A drop in food price inflation dragged on the figures, Julian Evans-

Pritchard of Capital Economics said in a commentary, noting a "continued pick-up in broader price pressures" especially in service sectors including health care and education.

"The summer holiday fuelled the seasonal increases in prices of some services," said NBS analyst Yu Qiumei in a statement. Air ticket prices and tourism agency charges rose 12.1 percent and 6.5 percent respectively month-onmonth. Evans-Pritchard said that inflation was likely to rise in coming months but not enough to concern policymakers. Shanghai stocks were slightly higher by the break yesterday, edging up 0.29 percent. — AFP



# WORLD STOCKS JUMP AS INVESTORS SEARCH FOR YIELD

**LONDON:** World stocks hit their highest levels in \$1.2983, down 0.4 percent on the day. almost a year as investors searched for yield, while sterling fell to its weakest in a month on the prospect of easier monetary policy after Britain's vote to leave the European Union. Wall Street was set to open modestly higher, according to index futures . lan McCafferty, a prominent Bank of England policy hawk, told The Times newspaper that, if the UK economy slowed as much as sentiment surveys have suggested, more easing would be required on top of the measures unveiled by the Bank last week.

That was enough to push sterling as low as \$1.2968, its weakest since July 11. It last traded at

But the picture was complicated by data from the British Retail Consortium showing the biggest rise in retail spending in Britain in six months in July. "McCafferty really underlined the dovishness of the MPC last week," said Jane Foley, a strategist with Rabobank in London. "But (reading the BRC data) consumers do seem to have been more robust than many had anticipated."

The BoE cut interest rates last week for the first time since 2009 to cushion the economic shock of the Brexit vote, and Australia cut its rates to a record low. New Zealand is widely expected to cut on Thursday.

Britain's blue-chip share index rose 0.3 percent, in line with a 0.4 percent rise in the pan-European STOXX 600 index . This lifted MSCI's all-country world index by 0.2 percent to a peak of 417.80 points, its highest since Aug. 19, 2015.

The European index was led higher by autos and banks and by forecast-beating company earnings. Overall, the second-quarter earnings season has been encouraging so far. Of the 77 percent of STOXX 600 companies that have reported second-quarter results, 61 percent have met or beaten expectations, according to StarMine data.

"European earnings are surprising on the positive

side, which is a confirmation of solid economic developments in Europe. However, the second half may not be as good due to uncertainties related to Brexit and some other political issues in Europe," UniCredit strategist Christian Stocker said.

The dollar dipped against a basket of major currencies, reversing earlier gains on slightly raised chances of higher Federal Reserve interest rates this year after Friday's stronger-thanexpected US jobs data. The yen edged up 0.2 percent to 102.19 per dollar while the euro slipped 0.1 percent to \$1.1075.

### Asia stocks advance

Asian stocks rose yesterday as fresh Chinese data provided signs of improving conditions for the world's second largest economy. China's producer prices fell in July at their slowest rate in nearly two years, fuelling hopes the end of a painful slowdown could be in sight for the Asian powerhouse which is a key driver of the global economy. Shanghai advanced 0.7 percent after the producer price index, which measures the cost of goods at the factory gate, fell 1.7 percent year-on-year in July. Asian shares hit one-year highs as a global search for yield drove a record inflow into emerging market funds. Analysts at Bank of America Merrill Lynch said last week the search had led to the largest five-week inflow on record to emerging market debt funds and the longest inflow streak to equity funds in two years.

MSCI's broadest index of Asia-Pacific shares outside Japan gained 0.3 percent, having already risen for three sessions in a row. Japan's Nikkei closed 0.7 percent high, rising for the fourth straight session.

inflation data kept alive the prospect of easier monetary policy. Consumer price slowed compared with June while a long decline in producer price moderated. The figure was better than expectations of a 2.0 decline in a Bloomberg News poll of economists and much less than the 2.6 percent fall in June. Protracted declines in the Producer Price Index bode ill for industrial prospects as customers seek to delay purchases in anticipation of lower prices in future, starving companies of business and funds.

Elsewhere traders were generally cautious after US markets retreated from record highs. Sydney added 0.3 percent by the close and Seoul ended 0.6 percent higher. Hong Kong closed down 0.1 percent. Tokyo closed up 0.7 percent on a weaker yen and as energy stocks

The dollar was at 102.45 yen, unchanged from Monday in New York but well up from levels below 101 seen last week. Japanese exporters benefit from a weaker yen as it inflates the value of their overseas profits.

Energy stocks rose after OPEC said it would hold an informal meeting in Algeria next month-hinting it could take action to stabilise the crude market. The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries said Monday that a meeting would take place on the sidelines of the International Energy Forum in Algeria from September 26 to 28, ahead of a planned meeting at the end of November.

Hong Kong-listed CNOOC and PetroChina were among those that recorded gains. In Tokyo energy exporter Inpex added 3.2 percent and refiner JX Holdings added 1.6 percent. In Sydney, Rio Tinto ticked up 1.6 percent, while Santos and Oil Search were also

## **BOE BREXIT PLAN CHALLENGED BY** WORLD AWASH WITH CHEAP MONEY

**LONDON:** The Bank of England's first rate cut since 2009 looks unlikely to be passed in full to borrowers, despite the BoE being ready to lend banks as much as 100 billion pounds (\$130 billion) to ensure it happens. The launch of the Term Funding Scheme (TFS) the BoE's biggest intervention in Britain's banking market in four years is likely to offer a modest boost to growth. But it also highlights the difficulty of implementing cuts in interest rates as they approach zero.

Governor Mark Carney said lenders had "no excuse" not to pass on August's quarter-point cut in interest rates to 0.25 percent, as the TFS would neutralise the negative impact of the rate cut on bank profits by providing lenders with cheap loans.

But less than a week later, things already look more complicated for the project that is part of the central bank's response to Britain's vote to quit the European Union. Britain's biggest mortgage lender, Lloyds Banking Group , is holding off cutting its main rate, while First Direct, part of HSBC, reduced the interest rate it pays out on one of its savings accounts by 0.4 percentage points.

"The narrative presented was a bit simplistic," said Ian Gordon, a banking analyst at Investec.

The key point is that British lenders vary greatly in how much they can benefit from the TFS, depending on whether they already have access to finance that costs them less than the 0.25 percent minimum charge for funding from the BoE scheme. Major lenders such as Royal Bank of Scotland, Barclays and HSBC already have more cash than they have been able to lend out. often from business and personal current accounts on which the banks pay little or no interest.

For them, the TFS will do nothing to reduce the squeeze on their net interest margin - the difference between savings and lending rates that is the main source of profit from lending.

As a result, interest rates on new two-vear fixed-rate mortgages -Britain's most popular type of home finance - were likely to drop by less than 25 basis points, Gordon said, as banks' sought to preserve profits and priced in a higher risk of default as the economic outlook darkened.

"I think prices will come down, but I'm skeptical you will see them come 25 basis points lower," Investec's Gordon said. Existing mortgage rates that tracked Bank Rate would fall, but credit card rates and new business lending - which is sensitive to the economic outlook - would prove stickier.

Bankers say Lloyds and smaller challenger banks such as Virgin Money, Shawbrook and Aldermore gain more from the scheme, as they rely on costlier wholesale finance and savings accounts.

Gordon said this gave them scope to cut the interest they paid savers by more than a quarter percentage point - an effect of the TFS which the BoE has not chosen to stress.

### **MODEST GAINS**

None of this means the TFS is a waste of time, but it is unlikely to have the same impact as the BoE's last big intervention, the Funding for Lending Scheme in 2012. "Overall I think it will provide a small stimulus to the economy ... but it's not a game-changer," Pantheon Macroeconomics' Samuel Tombs said.

The FLS came at a time when

British banks faced high borrowing costs due to the eurozone crisis, and offered incentives to lend as the economy gathered steam. In just over a year, it provided more than 40 billion pounds of finance to banks and building societies. By contrast, the TFS comes at a time when banks can already raise finance cheaply, and the BoE expects business and housing investment to fall sharply, reducing demand for loans.

"We are in a different world now where banks are in a much healthier position, where it's not really the supply of credit that is the constraint on the economy," BoE Deputy Governor Ben Broadbent told Reuters on Friday. "There is no point in offering very powerful incentives to lend ... because it is not clear they would be taken up."

The roughly 100 billion pounds of newly created money available via the TFS represents about 5 percent of outstanding UK loans, and a fair chunk may be taken up by banks refinancing old FLS borrowing for another four years at a cheaper rate.

Full pass through of last week's rate cut would take time, Broadbent said, and the BoE was not looking to police every single loan rate and would rely instead on competitive pressure to push down borrowing costs.

JP Morgan economist Allan Monks speculated that the TFS could ultimately provide a path for the BoE to introduce negative interest rates by the back door, circumventing Carney's opposition and effectively paying banks to lend. Broadbent, however, was quick to dismiss this. A European Central Bank scheme similar to the TFS, TLTRO II, showed the difficulty of getting banks to offer deposits or lend at negative rates, he said. —Reuters

## SOLID OUTLOOK FROM VALEANT, PROMISED CHANGES; SHARES UP

**NEW YORK:** Drugmaker Valeant Pharmaceuticals, a fast-growing Wall Street darling until its price-hiking business strategy made it a symbol of pharmaceutical company greed, said it's undergoing a restructuring as its new CEO attempts to turn it around and repair its tattered reputation.

The company has come under a harsh spotlight for repeatedly buying older medicines with limited competition and then jacking their prices up threefold or more, with no changes or improvements to the drugs. The Canadian company's spate of acquisitions and soaring revenue propelled its stock through the roof, while running up some \$30 billion in debt.

As soaring drug prices became a hot political issue, Valeant has been hit with three ongoing federal probes into its accounting and business practices and criticism from presidential candidates, forcing it to renounce its price-hiking strategy and push out Michael Pearson, the CEO behind that strategy.

Meanwhile, insurers and other payers

trying to reign in their costs for medicines successfully pressed for bigger drug discounts and rebates, which slashed Valeant's revenue from sales in developed countries by 14 percent in the second quarter. As a result, Valeant yesterday reported a wider loss and an 11 percent dip in total revenue during the quarter. Still, its shares jumped after the beleaguered company stuck by its financial forecast for the year and said it would unveil a new strategy. Valeant's losses widened to \$302.3 million, or 88 cents per share, from \$53 million, or 15 cents per share, a year prior. Earnings, adjusted for one-time gains and costs, came to \$1.40 per share.

Revenue tumbled to \$2.42 billion in the period. Both results fell short of Wall Street expectations. Analysts had expected per-share earnings of \$1.61, and revenue of \$2.59 billion, according to a survey by Zacks Investment Research. Despite a weak quarter, Valeant stuck to earlier projections of annual full-year earnings in the range of \$6.60 to \$7 per share, company statement. —AP

with revenue in the range of \$9.9 billion to \$10.1 billion.

That eased some concerns for investors, who have seen the value of the shares they hold lose more than 90 percent of their value over the past year. Shares jumped 13 percent to \$25.38 in morning trading yesterday. One year ago, shares cost about \$264.

Valeant Pharmaceuticals International Inc., based in Laval, Quebec, said it is taking steps to streamline its portfolio of products and has agreed to sell rights to several drugs. On Tuesday, Pearson's successor, CEO Joseph Papa, said that the company would be taking a "new strategic direction." No details about that direction were released, but anything that brings Valeant closer to a more typical pharmaceutical concern would be a relief to embattled investors.

"Although it will take time to implement and execute our turnaround plan, I am confident that we will show progress in the coming quarters," Papa said in a

# INDONESIAN CAPITAL'S AIRPORT OPENS \$560 MILLION TERMINAL

**JAKARTA:** The Indonesian capital's airport opened a new terminal yesterday after years of

operating at far above its passenger capacity. Domestic flights for national carrier Garuda began operating in the morning from Soekarno-Hatta airport's steel and glass \$560 million Terminal 3. Its international flights will shift to the new terminal next month. Other airlines will gradually move their flights to the terminal and the airport company plans to start refurbishing two old terminals, built in 1984

and 1992, later this year.

Indonesia, an archipelago of more than 250 million people, is one of world's fastest growing air travel markets. But many international airlines bypass the capital Jakarta in favor of modern, high-capacity airports at Bangkok, Singapore or Kuala Lumpur for their Southeast Asian stopovers. The airport operator and government hopes the new terminal, and a third runway that is under development, will change that.

Budi Karya Sumadi, Indonesia's transport

minister and former president of the airport company, said "this terminal was built to change the image of the capital Jakarta." Soekarno-Hatta airport will be able to handle 62 million passengers a year once the renovated terminals are fully operational again in early 2018. The airport handled about 54 million passengers last year, making it the 18th busiest in the world. according to Airports Council International. An electric train from the airport to the city is slated for completion in early 2017. —AP



Livestreaming has also made the news in recent weeks as House Democrats used Periscope to broadcast a sit-in over gun control after the Republican majority cut off television cameras. It was also got attention when a Minnesota woman used Facebook Live to stream footage of her dying boyfriend after he was shot by police. And it might come up during the Olympics if spectators and athletes livestream events publicly a violation of ticketing and Olympic rules and a challenge to the billions of dollars TV companies pay for rights. Below are some of the most popular ways to livestream from your phone:

### **FACEBOOK LIVE**

Anyone with a Facebook account can livestream anything using Facebook's app. To use it, tap the empty box where your status update would go. A menu should pop up with the option for "live video." A couple of taps later, you are live, broadcasting to your friends. You can change the privacy setting to make your live video public, too. The video is available for replay once you are done. You can delete it or save it on your phone if you want.

### PERISCOPE

The Twitter-owned video-streaming app made its debut about a year ago, well-timed with the exponential growth of people watching and taking videos on their smartphones. You can broadcast to select followers or the broader public. You can share your precise location or keep it private. Viewers can send comments, and streams can be shared on Twitter, Facebook or other social media services.

### **MEERKAT**

Seventeen months ago, Meerkat was the darling of the South By Southwest Interactive tech confab, seemingly destined to make livestreaming the next hot thing. Then came Periscope and Facebook Live, and Meerkat's popularity dropped. The company is no longer focused on livestreaming and has instead "pivoted" - Silicon Valley speak for shifting resources elsewhere when your first (or second, or third) idea doesn't work.

### YOUNOW

You sign in with their Twitter, Facebook, Google or Instagram account to stream live videos. YouNow also lets you "discover talented broadcasters" and video chat live with people around the world, as its website touts. Music is an especially popular broadcast topic, but you'll find the usual stuff as well, such as people livestreaming themselves as they sleep. Zzzzz.

### TWITCH

The Amazon-owned livestreaming service started off as a way for gamers to stream their gameplay and show off their skills. Now, Twitch is broadening its reach. It has added channels in its "creative" area for people to broadcast live music, drawing, programming and so on. You can pay a subscription fee for certain benefits on channels, and even tip performers. People can livestream from traditional computers, too - not just smartphones, as most other services require. - AP

# BOOM IN LIVE VIDEO HELPING FEW CREATORS MAKE A LIVING

## **EMERGING AS A LUCRATIVE CORNER OF THE INTERNET**

**ANAHEIM:** Casey Cooper is one of the most famous drummers on the planet right now. He has a million followers on YouTube, and his flaming-sticks drumming cover of Ellie Goulding's "Burn" is insane. But he'd just prefer you skip his recorded performances and instead catch him live - on streaming video, that is - because he can make more money that way.

Live video is fast emerging as a lucrative corner of the internet where artists can profit from fans who tip lavishly in order to rub virtual shoulders with their favorite broadcasters. Startups such as Ampli.fi and YouNow are helping foster a digital economy around live video. Now, deeppocketed tech goliaths like Facebook, Twitter and Snapchat are joining the party. Different performers have different reasons for preferring live video. Cooper, 24, says fan tips can bring in much more than his hundreds of millions of views on YouTube, where copyright holders claim the ad revenue for use of their underlying songs.

Recording labels haven't reached into live performers' tip jars as they can't really replace downloads or streams of songs. A handful of sites including YouNow have registered to pay songwriting royalties, but the fee is minimal, according to the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers. Cooper's first session on Ampli.fi, a musician-focused streaming service, netted him nearly \$100 in about an hour.

### Power to the people

"It's so powerful," says Cooper, who broadcast his live show from his home in Canton, Georgia. "People will say, 'Please, please, please just shout me out. Say my username." Such intense fan interaction is one reason internet and media companies are jump-starting their live-video efforts. Facebook is spending tens of millions of dollars recruiting celebrities such as Kevin Hart and Gordon Ramsay for shows on its Facebook Live system. YouTube

just announced the ability to go live from your mobile phone. And cable giant Comcast is among several companies that invested \$15 million in October in YouNow, a livestreaming service popular among teens.

How popular? Just ask Sandra Alvarez, a 14-year-old student from Los Angeles who says she used to spend \$50 a month - more than half her allowance - tipping broadcasters on YouNow. She would get notified whenever one went live; with some, she says, she would tune in "basically every time." Some services like upstart Live.me cultivate such devotion by rewarding Alvarez and other followers with daily dollops of digital currency that they can use to buy their favorites virtual gifts.

### Recorded live

But live video isn't always easy to watch. Broadcasts on Twitter-owned Periscope are regularly over before many people even find out about them. Live video requires habits that feel like a return to the old days of broadcast TV. So more companies are giving users a way to save and share recordings - though at that point they're not really live anymore, of course.

Facebook Live stored its videos from the start. That allowed Candace Payne's giggling live selfie of trying on a Chewbacca mask to become an internet sensation with 160 million views since May, making it Facebook's most popular "live" video so far. Periscope is testing the ability to save videos longer than the customary 24 hours by adding a "save" hashtag to a stream title. YouNow is adding "Moments" for viewers to share snippets of streams.

### Fan energy into money

The big question is whether and how live video can turn into a real business. One revenue source is advertising. Twitter, for instance, will stream 10 Thursday Night Football games in the coming season and has already

sold 60 percent of its ad spots. But the real prize could be tapping into the spontaneous urge for fans to support small-scale streamers with whom they feel an instant, real-time connection. It's a little like tipping buskers, but with the convenience of credit cards and the distance of the internet.

Many fans will pay \$5 a month to get VIP status with an artist, says Ampli.fi founder Bart Decrem, a serial entrepreneur who sold a mobile game startup to Disney in 2010. That mostly just gets them a gold star beside their username in the chat room - though that boosts their chance of being noticed by the artist. "It's completely intangible," Decrem says. "That's the most powerful thing."

### Weekend at Bernie's

Such intangible economics have helped 71-year-old Bernie Katzman and his wife Mindy escape their workaday lives of teaching and nursing. From their home in Jacksonville, Florida, he plays keyboards and sings - his left hand on a Steinway, his right on a synthesizer. She chats and sometimes cooks healthy dishes. It's been nearly a year since their 22-year-old son introduced them to Twitch, an Amazon-owned streaming service that is mostly devoted to live playback of videogame battles. "We thought (Twitch) was a neuromuscular issue," says Mindy, 51. "We had no idea what streaming even meant."

The Katzmans now have more than 190,000 followers, among them nearly 500 subscribers paying \$5 a month. Add in the tips, including \$5 a pop to guarantee that Bernie plays a song request, and it provides a healthy supplement to retirement income. Fans regularly send pictures of their pets and ask marriage advice, which the couple - now married 29 years - gladly provides. All told, it's a full-time job for both of them. "This has been an unbelievable adventure," Bernie says. "We are pioneers in the field of streaming." — AP

# HULU DROPPING FREE VIDEO AS IT PREPARES CABLE TV ALTERNATIVE

**NEW YORK:** Hulu is dropping the free TV episodes that it was initially known for as it works on an online television service to rival cable TV. Free episodes - typically the most recent four or five episodes from a show's current season - will be gone from the site within a few weeks. Instead, Hulu is making free episodes available through Yahoo.

While Hulu started as a free site, supported by advertising, free video has become increasingly more difficult to find as Hulu tries to lure viewers into a subscription - \$8 a month for a plan with ads, and \$12 without. In recent months, visitors to Hulu.com have been presented with prominent links to subscribe, with links to free video buried in a menu after signing in. And free episodes haven't been available on Hulu's mobile apps or streaming-TV devices, just on Hulu.com from a traditional computer. Now, they won't be on Hulu.com at all.

Devotees of Hulu's free on-demand videos will be able to find them by visiting the new Yahoo View site from a computer. The Yahoo site will not have free episodes of CW shows such as "Arrow" and "The Flash," as Hulu has been offering, because CW has a broader deal with Netflix instead. Yahoo says it will have the past five episodes of ABC, NBC and Fox shows available. The Fox shows will appear eight days after their TV airing, as is the practice at Hulu.com now. Yahoo will also have some older CBS shows.

### Licensing restrictions

The episodes on Yahoo are not currently available on a phone, although Yahoo is working on a mobile web version and an app. Yahoo says the mobile version will be free, but it may not have all

the same video as the desktop computer site because of content licensing restrictions. Hulu says relatively few people watch the free videos. It now has about 12 million subscribers who pay for original shows, the entire current seasons of some network shows and access to Hulu's library on mobile and streaming-TV devices like Roku.

Hulu also plans to launch a live online TV service next year. It would show broadcast and cable channels in real time, without making viewers wait until the next day for episodes. In a move that could make that service more appealing, Time Warner Inc. recently took a 10 percent stake in Hulu, joining the TV and movie conglomerates - Walt Disney Co., 21st Century Fox and Comcast's NBCUniversal - that already owned it. Time Warner plans to contribute some of its channels, including TNT and TBS,

Several other companies already offer live, paid TV over the internet, including Sony and Dish. DirecTV plans a service for later this year as well. Yahoo also has broader ambitions for View. It wants to add video from other Yahoo properties and from other networks and studios. However, its previous attempt at an online video hub, Yahoo Screen, shut down in January, despite having new episodes of the cult comedy "Community" after its cancellation by NBC.

Verizon, which is buying Yahoo to help the phone company grow a digital advertising business, makes TV episodes and short videos available on its go90 mobile app. Phil Lynch, the head of media and content partnerships at Yahoo, says that as the deal gets closer to closing early next year, it "makes sense that we have integration discussions." — AP

# GAMING BOOST TEENS' SCHOOL RESULTS: AUSTRALIAN STUDY

**SYDNEY:** Playing online games may boost teenagers' school results while spending time on social networks such as Facebook could do the opposite, according to an Australian study. The research, based on the performance of 15-year-old Australians in the globally recognized Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) tests, looked at the relationship between internet usage and educational outcomes.

"The analysis reveals that children who regularly use online social networks, such as Facebook, tend to obtain lower scores in math, reading, and science than students who never or hardly ever use these sites," it said. "Conversely, the analysis shows that those students who play online video games obtain higher scores on PISA tests, all other things being equal," the study published in the International Journal of Communication said. The study said it was possible that children who were already gifted in maths, science and reading were more likely to play online games.

But it added that while both gaming and socializing used time that teenagers could otherwise spend studying, video games "potentially allow students to apply and sharpen skills learned in school". "Students who play online games almost every day score 15 points above the average in maths and 17 points above the average in science," study author Alberto Posso said yesterday.

"When you play online games you're solving puzzles to move to the next level and that involves using some of the general knowledge and skills in maths, reading and science that you've been taught during the day."

Students who used online social networks on a daily basis scored 20 points lower in maths than a student who never used this type of social media, according to the study, which used the PISA ranking for 12,000 pupils from 2012 and controlled for other influences. "Students who are regularly on social media are, of course, losing time that could be spent on study-but it may also indicate that they are struggling with maths, reading and science and are going online to socialize instead," Posso said.

Internet usage among teenagers is considered particularly high in Australia where 97 percent of 15 to 17 year olds say they frequently go online. Some 78 percent of the children in the sample used online social networks almost every day or every day. Use of the internet was not bad in itself, and Posso, from the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology, suggested teachers consider incorporating popular video games into their lessons-"as long as they're not violent ones". He also said other factors also needed to be considered, with skipping school every day about twice as bad for results as using Facebook or chatting online daily. — AFP

# TEEN WHO POSTED WEAPONIZED DRONE VIDEOS FIGHTS EXPULSION

**NEW BRITAIN:** A teenager who posted online videos of flying drones shooting a gun and a flamethrower in his backyard appeared in court Monday to fight his expulsion from Central Connecticut State University. Austin Haughwout, 19, is suing university officials in an effort to return to school, and on Monday in New Britain he challenged the process that led to his expulsion, WTIC-AM reported.

Central Connecticut State officials say Haughwout was kicked out for threatening to shoot people at the school. An attorney for Haughwout says what some may have interpreted as threats were actually jokes, protected by free speech. Haughwout believes his drone videos were the real reason he got kicked out. School officials have denied that.

Haughwout uploaded the widely viewed videos to his YouTube channel last year. One shows a flying drone equipped with a handgun firing rounds. Another shows a flying drone with a flamethrower lighting up a spit-roasting turkey. Both videos were recorded in the family's yard in Clinton. The videos led the Federal Aviation Administration to subpoena Haughwout and his father late last year, saying the

people or property. Haughwout and his father, Bret Haughwout, refused to comply at first, saying the subpoenas violated their constitutional right to be free from unreasonable searches and seizures and questioning the agency's authority to regulate recreational drones.

weaponized drones were capable of causing serious injury to

Last month, a federal judge in New Haven ordered the Haughwouts to comply with the FAA subpoenas. Austin Haughwout has been in and out of the news over the past two years. Clinton police announced in June that they charged him with enticing a minor with a computer, attempted sexual assault and possession of child pornography after police say they found child porn on his cellphone. His lawyer has called that arrest warrant "overly broad" and suggested that Clinton police had it out for his client because of the drone videos. Last year, Clinton police charged him with assaulting officers. The case remains pending. In 2014, a woman was charged with assaulting Haughwout because she was upset he was using a drone to record video above a beach in Madison. Haughwout posted footage of the confrontation on YouTube. — AP

### VETERAN VITALITY: SPORTS CAMP CHALLENGES AND CHANGES THEM

**PROVIDENCE:** Marine veteran Joyce Ralph sometimes stays at home in Massachusetts instead of going for a bike ride or doing other things she likes to do. She feels too anxious because of her post-traumatic stress disorder.

Army veteran Paul Miosek sometimes feels isolated at his home in New York. No one else he knows is in a wheelchair. The two were among a group of about 50 veterans who took part in July in the Veterans Affairs New England Summer Sports Clinic in Rhode Island. For a week, they kayaked, water skied, cycled and sailed - activities designed to get them and other veterans thinking more about what they can than can't do. "This gives me a chance, with my anxiety, to push myself a little further, to realize there are safe places in the world," said Ralph, 52, of Halifax, Massachusetts.

The veterans ranged in age from their 20s to 80s. The rehabilitation clinic is open to veterans with spinal cord injuries, amputations, vision loss, mental health problems and other disabilities. Miosek (pronounced MY'-sak), 47, of Scotia, New York, lost both legs in 1990 when his head hit a power cable as he stood atop an armored vehicle in Germany, then fell 20 feet. Meeting other veterans at the clinic with similar injuries made him feel he's not alone.

"I feel a kinship toward them, since we are in that boat together," he said. "While in service, we faced a lot of obstacles that we overcame. Now that I'm a disabled veteran, and with other disabled veterans, there are things that we can overcome together, as well." In Coventry, Rhode Island, VA volunteers and water ski instructors set up different ways veterans could ski depending on their needs, from a sling-like seat in the center of a wide ski to a three-person tube.

### 'You made my life!'

Navy veteran Raquel "Rachel" Ardin uses a wheelchair most of the time. Ardin, 62, of

North Hartland, Vermont, was serving in Greece when she broke her neck falling out of a bunk in 1976. She taught herself to walk again, but the scar tissue from her injury began causing problems several years ago. During her first run of the day, and her first time ever on water skis, Ardin whooped the whole way.

The crowd of volunteers and fellow veterans on shore clapped and cheered. Afterward, Ardin told the volunteers, "You made my day. You made my life!" "I want to cry, I'm so happy," she told them. "Thank you, guys!" The sports clinic is modeled after the VA's national adaptive sports program, in which veterans nationwide compete in games. The VA Boston Healthcare System runs it, and the Providence VA Medical Center hosts it.

"Some of the more traditional activities that occur in VA hospitals, bingo, card playing, those sorts of things, while those are nice, we had a young generation that came out of the battlefield," said Richard Leeman, assistant chief of voluntary services in Boston. "They wanted to do the things they did prior to their injury."

There's also a winter sports clinic for skiing and snowboarding at Mount Sunapee Resort in New Hampshire. This was the seventh year of the summer clinic and the third time the Providence medical center has hosted it. The VA worked with many local groups to organize the activities.

"They pushed themselves to a new limit that they now know they can do," said Susan MacKenzie, the medical center's director

"They have confidence that they can set goals for themselves and move forward, not just in sports but in any part of their life." Miosek said he "feels alive" at the clinic. "I'm able to get the energy out and do the things that I can't do at home," he said. "I use that energy all year long, to kind of let go and go for it." — AP

# MAN FINDS MAMMOTH TUSK WHILE DIGGING ON PROPERTY

**PRESTON:** An Idaho man stumbled upon a rare find while using a backhoe to dig in a gravel pit on his property. "It came to the point where I seen something weird or different inside the hill so I just stopped, kinda brushed off some of it," Kasey Keller of Preston told KIFI-TV.

Upon closer inspection, the object Keller first thought was a plastic pipe or petrified wood appeared to be bone. He decided to call in the experts. The object, according to Utah State University, was a 31/2-foot tusk of a Columbian mammoth. It could be anywhere from 12,000 to 15,000 years old.

Both Utah State University and Brigham Young University took a piece of the tusk for carbon dating. Columbian mammoths were 12 feet to 15 feet tall and likely roamed the grasslands of Lake Bonneville,

according to the university. The type of sediment the tusk was found in indicates that it washed up after flooding, the school said. Keller said paleontologists from BYU said they will return the tusk after preserving the mammoth remains. "From what I was told, the odds of finding that in this area are rarer than finding a needle in a haystack," said Keller. "And according to USU, they said they haven't found any other mammoth remains in Cache Valley."

He said the discovery inspired his twin boys, who recovered pieces of the tusk that broke off when Keller was digging with the backhoe. "It's kinda cool to think what actually was here on your property or you know, by your house," Keller said. "I'm definitely going to be digging with a lot more gracefulness because who knows what I might find." — AP

# NEW ZEALAND FARM COMPANY STOPS USING PALM OIL

**WELLINGTON:** New Zealand's state-owned farming company said Monday it will stop using palm kernel products to feed its animals as it seeks to take better care of the environment. Landcorp announced it will stop using the products by the middle of next year. Environmentalists have linked growth in the palm oil industry to rainforest destruction in Indonesia, which in turn is contributing to the decline in species like the Sumatran tiger. Landcorp Chief Executive Steven Carden told The Associated Press that consumers worldwide are willing to pay a premium for natural products, including grass-fed meat and dairy. "We are really concerned with producing food in a responsible and environmentally friendly way," Carden said

He said making the change also made sense

from a strategic and commercial viewpoint. Farmers typically use imported palm kernel cake, also known as expeller, as part of a diet for dairy cows, especially during the winter or when natural feed is low. The cake is a byproduct of palm oil production. Palm oil is a common ingredient in many household products, from margarine to lipstick. Carden said the company will replace palm products with locally grown alternatives like maize silage and chicory. Landcorp is one of the largest farming companies in New Zealand, with 140 farms and 850,000 animals. It uses about 15,000 metric tons of palm cake each year. But thousands of dairy farmers who provide milk to the country's biggest company Fonterra will continue to use the product, after Fonterra said Monday it had no immediate plans to stop using it. — AP

# BANGLADESHI BOY WITH MYSTERIOUS 'OLD MAN' ILLNESS BAFFLES DOCTORS

'THE CURIOUS CASE OF BAYEZID SHIKDAR'

**DHAKA:** A four-year-old Bangladeshi boy suffering from a mysterious illness that makes him look like an old man has been admitted to hospital for tests, doctors and his family said. Doctors at a top hospital in Dhaka have agreed to try to diagnose and treat Bayezid Shikdar, who comes from a poor farming family, for free after learning of his plight on the weekend. Born with excess skin that hangs from his limbs and face causing it to sag, Bayezid also suffers from related heart, vision and hearing problems. His father, Lablu Shikdar, said numerous doctors have been at a loss to explain his condition.

"We sold our land to treat him at local hospitals. We took him to religious healers and herbal doctors, but his condition did not change. This hospital is our last hope," Shikdar told AFP at Dhaka Medical College Hospital this week. "We hope they'll make him look like any other normal child." Doctors initially suspected he suffered from progeria which causes rapid and premature ageing shortly after birth, leading to severe health complications. The extremely rare genetic disorder was the subject of Hollywood movie "The Curious Case of Benjamin Button" starring Brad Pitt. But doctors at the Dhaka hospital expressed caution, saying extensive tests were needed.

### Multitude of problems

"In progeria, the ageing process accelerates with time," Abul Kalam, head of the hospital's burns and plastic surgery unit, told AFP on Monday. "But Bayezid's parents have said the ageing of their boy has been halted recently. He has shown signs of improvement. "We're investigating his condition. In addition to loose skin, he

has problems in his heart, ear, eyes and penis." Doctors said his genetic condition may also be the result of inbreeding, with marriage among relatives including first cousins common in Bangladesh's rural areas.

Bayezid's mother, Khatun, stressed that her son was just like any other child. "He is very fond of fish and rice. He plays football and hide and seek with his cousins," she told AFP after her son's case was highlighted in Bangladesh media on the weekend. "When I first saw him he looked like a bundle of skin. We had no idea what he was afflicted with. We thought the condition would go away soon." "He is an extremely talented boy. There are days he grabs books and wants to go to school. But we thought he's still too young." Doctors at the same hospital have also been treating a 26-year-old father dubbed "Tree Man" for the rare and massive bark-like growths on his hands and feet. — AFP

# TINY ASIAN BEETLE WREAKS HAVOC ON N AMERICA TREES

**CHICAGO:** Over the next two years, grounds crews in St. Louis will cut down nearly one out of every five trees, altering the US city's leafy landscape for at least a generation. The Midwestern metropolis made the tough decision with the knowledge that if it does not cut down the trees, most will quickly die. St Louis is the latest victim of the Emerald Ash Borer, an Asian beetle smaller than a penny, which emigrated from China via shipping materials and is destroying millions of trees in North America.

The insect targets the Ash tree-a common variety in Midwestern cities, where the tree can survive cramped sidewalks, harsh winters and road salts used to keep streets clear of ice and snow. In St Louis, city forestry commissioner Skip Kincaid is tasked with dealing with the invasive pest and the destruction it is expected to cause in the next few years. "I'm trying as best I can to enlighten the public about how devastating it is going to be," Kincaid said. To head off the Emerald Ash Borer's advance, Kincaid will cut down almost all of the city's 14,000 Ash trees-or roughly 17 percent of all trees-over the next two years.

Scientists have discovered a pesticide treatment that can keep the insect from killing trees. But Kincaid said that wasn't an economically feasible solution, as it must be repeatedly applied every other year. The forestry expert surveyed the value of each tree, quantifying the benefits they provide in terms of property values, reducing storm water runoff, and reducing energy costs through natural cooling. Only 1,000 made the cut. The rest will be removed and replaced with a variety of species, but it will be years before they reach the size of the Ash trees. "This is something where quite honestly, we really have no other choice," Kincaid said.

### A 'devastating' bug

Noel Schneeberger, a US Forest Service expert at the forefront of the beetle battle, says once the Emerald Ash Borer infests an Ash, the chances of it surviving are basically nil. "In terms of targeting a single genus of trees, it's pretty devastating," Schneeberger said. Officials have tried regional quarantines to keep the bug from spreading. But barring the transportation of firewood-thought to be the primary way the bug spreads-has not worked. Scientists estimate that about 30 million trees have already succumbed to the beetle, and by the time its path of destruction concludes, hundreds of millions more will be dead, brittle, and ready to fall during a storm.

What perplexed scientists at first was that the Emerald Ash Borer is a relatively benign beetle in its native East Asia-where Ash trees have evolved with the insect. It makes so little fuss in Asia that when it arrived in North America, scientists were not even able to identify the strange insect. In East Asia, the bug only seems to attack Ash trees that are already sick or dying. Healthy Ash appear to have a natural chemical resistance. But a vast majority of Ash trees in North America do not, and the bug has been spreading unchecked since its arrival on the continent in 2002. It has reached 26 US states, as far south as Texas, and north into Canada. In one experiment, scientists were able to induce North American Ash trees into producing compounds necessary to kill the beetle. The question of whether such efforts can be used en masse remain to be answered.

### Fighting the insect

The infestation has been particularly devastating for many cities in the Midwest, where streets can have rows of Ash trees for blocks at a time. The insect burrows into an Ash tree, creating tunnels that completely destroy the tree's ability to move nutrients through its bark. The destruction is so thorough that the tree usually starves to death in less than five years. The US Forest Service labels the beetle "the most devastating forest insect to reach North America in modern times."

Still, over the last 14 years, scientists have made progress in learning more about the beetle, the tree variety it targets, and about other previously unknown insects. Through trial and error, they discovered that a coordinated response can keep trees alive. Heavily infested trees should be removed and healthy trees treated with certain pesticides applied every two years. St Louis is following a similar planfocusing on the healthiest and biggest trees, and getting rid of the rest. "St Louis has probably the approach that is used most commonly across the country," said Richard Hauer, a professor of urban forestry at the University of Wisconsin who has been helping cities deal with the problem.

### How to co-exist

In forests, it's a different story, and scientists are trying to figure out how best to handle the Emerald Ash Borer now that it has moved in. For

one, woodpeckers seem to love to eat the beetle's larvae. They are proving a natural predator, but the plucky birds can't do the job by themselves. Researchers found that they eat only about 16 percent of all Ash Borer larvae. In China, scientists found other natural predators previously unknown to science-small parasitic insects which are relatives of ants and wasps. Working together, the parasites can reduce the beetle's populations dramatically-anywhere from 50 to 90 percent.

Scientists have begun controlled releases of the parasitic insects in North America, and are studying whether they can create a biological balance of sorts, to reduce the Ash Borer population and keep more trees alive. But any hope that millions of trees can be saved is a false one, as the parasite controls are in their "infancy," Hauer said. "Give it several decades, or a century," he said, pointing out that biological controls for previous deadly infestations have taken 50 years or more to have an effect. In cities, one of the key lessons to take away from the Ash Borer invasion, is that too much of one tree is not a good thing, Kincaid said.

In St Louis, he is planning to replace Ash with a far greater diversity of trees, so that no one insect can wreak mass havoc again. "We're in a world now where every year, it's a different invasive pest," Kincaid said. "That's why it's critical to have this diversity of species. So if something moves in... you won't wipe out 17 percent of your street trees." — AFP

# RECORD NUMBER OF HIV CASES IN PHILIPPINES PROMPTS ACTION

JAKARTA: The Philippines has posted a record number of new HIV infections, prompting campaigners to call on authorities to step up efforts to battle the potentially deadly disease. A total of 841 new cases were recorded in June, the highest ever monthly figure since the country's first reported case in 1984, according to the health department's latest

statistics released this week.

Over 90 percent, or 777 cases, were trans-

mitted through sexual contact, the majority of them among men who have sex with men. Injecting drug users accounted for 60 new cases and the remaining four were cases of mother-to-child transmission. New cases of the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) which can lead to AIDS have been rising in the Philippines, bucking the international trend

which shows new infections falling.
"This is a cause of concern for us," Gerald

Santos from Manila-based campaign group Project Red Ribbon told the Thomson Reuters Foundation yesterday. "But to look at it with the glass half full, it also shows awareness is at an all-time high, meaning more people are aware of HIV and are getting tested." However, he said the actual number of new infections could be higher, as stigma associated with HIV prevents at-risk group from getting tested. "The government should double their efforts

in spreading awareness about HIV before it is too late," added Santos, the group's treasurer.

too late," added Santos, the group's treasurer.

The Philippines saw new infections double between 2001 and 2012, according to a UN AIDS agency (UNAIDS) report in 2013 which showed the epidemic was also expanding in Indonesia and Pakistan. Increasing infections among injecting drug users sharing contaminated needles combined with low condom use and high fertility rates have raised con-

cern over "downstream" HIV infections - when the virus spreads to people not typically at risk of HIV, like children who acquire the virus through mother-to-child transmission. There have been 34,999 HIV cases in the Philippines since record-keeping started in 1984, with 83 percent diagnosed in the last five years, according to the health department. Globally, some 36.7 million people are living with HIV, according to UNAIDS. — Reuters

# CLINTON TO CALL ON CONGRESS TO START ACTION ON ZIKA VIRUS

WASHINGTON: Hillary Clinton will call on Congress to return to Washington and pass emergency funding for the Zika response during a visit to a Miami neighborhood dealing with the first US outbreak of the disease. Yesterday afternoon, the Democratic presidential candidate plans to tour the Borinquen Medical Center, a health clinic close to the Wynwood area where 16 non-travel related cases have been diagnosed.

She will demand Republican leaders bring Congress back in session to either pass stalled legislation or craft a new bipartisan compromise bill to provide funding for testing, treatment and research on the disease, according to aides briefed on her plans.

Clinton's running mate, Virginia Sen Tim Kaine, has already said he'd return to Washington for a vote on a Zika bill. Until this month, the only known Zika cases in the United States were in people who had recently traveled to Latin America and the Caribbean. Federal officials last week warned pregnant women to avoid the Miami neighborhood and a 1-square-mile area around it.

**Spreading disease** 

Public health experts worry about the dis-

ease spreading: Florida health officials said on Monday they're investigating a case of Zika virus infection in Palm Beach County that was likely contracted in the United States. Lawmakers left Washington in mid-July for a seven-week recess without approving any of the \$1.9 billion that President Barack Obama requested in February to develop a vaccine and control the mosquitoes that carry the virus.

Both sides have been pointing fingers since. Obama, Clinton and Democrats blame Republicans for politicizing the legislation by adding a provision to a \$1.1 billion take-it-orleave-it measure that would have blocked Planned Parenthood clinics in Puerto Rico from receiving money. Republicans say the administration has not spent money that has already been provided and is trying to play politics in an election year.

Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky, has signaled he is in no rush to return. Writing in the Lexington (Ky) Herald-Leader last week, he criticized Democrats for balking at passing the bill. He said they'll get another chance after Labor Day when Congress is back in session. Clinton supported the bill, which her policy aide Ann O'Leary called "a critical first step to protect public health and ultimately save lives" in a post on the website

She laid out a plan to combat the virus last March, which included allocating \$1.8 billion in emergency funds.

A month later, she dispatched two of her aides to Puerto Rico, where hundreds of cases have been detected, to meet with medical professionals. "Zika is real. It's dangerous. And if we're serious about stopping this epidemic in its tracks, then there's no time to waste," Clinton wrote in a June op-ed in the Sun Sentinel. — AP

### STUDY LINKS GLOBAL WARMING TO RISE IN WATERBORNE ILLNESSES

**WASHINGTON:** Rising global temperatures are clearly linked to increasing waterborne food poisoning, particularly from eating raw oysters, along with other nasty infections, a new study shows. About a dozen species of vibrio (VIB'-ree-oh) bacteria make people sick from eating raw or undercooked seafood or drinking or swimming in tainted water. It also causes cholera, although that was not the focus of the research.

Lab-confirmed vibrio infections in the United States have increased from an average of about 390 a year from the late 1990s to an average of 1,030 in recent years, according to the Centers for Disease

Control and Prevention. But most cases aren't confirmed by tests and reported. "It's a remarkable increase on an annual basis," said study lead author Rita Colwell of the University of Maryland, a top microbiologist who used to head the National Science Foundation. The study examined Europe and North America, but the most consistent tracking of vibrio illnesses were in the United States. The CDC blames about 100 deaths a year on vibrio on average.

Even Alaska, where such outbreaks used to be unheard of because the bacteria needs warm water, is getting cases from people eating vibrio-infected oysters,

### RESEARCHERS ASKING FOR OLD PHOTOS OF LAKE TAHOE ALGAE

**INCLINE VILLAGE:** With all their modern scientific equipment and state-of-the-art computer models, researchers trying to better understand the effect of algae growth in Lake Tahoe are searching for new tools to aid in their mission - old photo albums. Experts at the UC Davis Tahoe Environmental Research Center said in an annual report last week that the mountain lake is still getting warmer, regional winters are still getting shorter and snowfall is still on the decline. Water quality also has worsened a bit. What is less clear, however, is the trend in long-term algae growth.

"Everyone wants to know if there's more of this stuff, but we don't know," said Geoff Schladow, a professor of water resources and environmental engineering at UC Davis. Researchers study algae growth because it is linked to high levels of nutrients, which enter the lake both atmospherically and through stormwater runoff. Fertilizer, for example, contains nutrients and can find its way into the lake when it rains, thus contributing to algae growth.

"We have low rainfall and low sediments coming in. You would expect the clarity to be better," Schladow said last week during a presentation on the campus of Sierra Nevada College in Incline Village, according to the Sierra Sun.

But despite a reduction in the amount of sediment entering the lake last year because of the ongoing drought in the West, the concentration of nitrate is actually higher. The problem is, scientists have already been measuring algae growth at Tahoe since the 2000s. "What we're left to use is anecdotal data," Schladow said. "We also ask for old photos, so if anyone has some they'd like to share, unfortunately that is the only older data we have." Scott Hackley, a staff research associate at UC Davis, said he's worked with archivists at the University of Nevada, Reno, to find old photos, but he and his team are hopeful that the community can help as well. "It'd be nice to get some old photos with the year, time of year and the location . to fill in some of the historical gaps," he said. — AP

# GREAT BALLS OF FIRE FROM THE SKY: PREPARE FOR A METEOR 'OUTBURST'

### SKY-GAZERS ARE IN FOR A SPECIAL TREAT

**PARIS:** Northern hemisphere sky-gazers are in for a special treat tomorrow night with a rare shooting star "outburst", which astronomers hope will not be marred by clouds and a bright Moon. For about an hour around 2300 GMT, there will be more than double the usual fireball activity associated with the annual Perseid meteor shower.

"There will be 200 or maybe as many as 300 (shooting stars) per hour," observed from a very dark site, astronomer Mark Bailey of the Armagh Observatory in Northern Ireland told AFP. "This outburst, as we call it... doesn't last that long. It might last an hour or a couple of hours," he said. Normally, the Perseids regale Earthlings with a show of about 100-120 shooting stars per hour. The event builds up over about two weeks, peaking in mid-August.

"Some years are better than others... and then there are exceptional years like this year," Bailey said. The Perseids happen when Earth hits a wide belt of debris left behind by the comet Tuttle-Swift on its elongated, 133-year orbit around the Sun. Each meteor is a piece of bro-

ken-off comet, which explodes as it hits Earth's atmosphere. Within the broad belt of debris there are also denser dust ribbons created when the comet passes closest to the Sun in its orbit-a juncture called perihelion. This year, Earth is on a collision course with three of the most heavily populated of these trails-created in the years 1862, 1737 and 1479.

### 'Kamikaze run'

"The meteors you'll see this year are from comet flybys that occurred hundreds if not thousands of years ago," NASA meteoroid expert Bill Cooke said in a statement. "And they've travelled billions of miles before their kamikaze run into Earth's atmosphere." However, there is no risk to our planet. In fact, astronomers' main concern is the weather, with cloud cover predicted for parts of Europe.

There is also the dimming impact of our own satellite-the Moon-which will be in a bright phase, making it harder to observe the sharp but short-lived bursts of meteors exploding. "It is unfortunate that it is in a waxing phase," said Bailey. "So we should really be observing after moonset"-some 30 minutes into the outburst. He advised people to get as far away from clouds and electric light as possible in order to enjoy the show. No telescope or special equipment is needed. "Wrap up warm, be prepared to sit comfortably on a deck chair or whatever, a glass of wine in your hand maybe, and then allow time for your eyes to become accustomed to the dark," which can take as long as 20 minutes, Bailey said.

The next mega-outburst of the Perseids is predicted to occur on August 12, 2028, and will feature the dust trail produced by the comet during its 1479 perihelion passage. The yearly show got its name because the stars appear to fly out of the constellation Perseus, visible in the Northern Hemisphere. It is also known as "tears of St Lawrence" in honor of a Christian saint tortured to death by the Romans in AD 258. According to legend, Laurentius was martyred on a iron grill over a fire, during which ordeal he is said to have quipped to his persecutors: "Turn me over. I'm done on this side!" He is a patron saint of cooks. — AFP



# What color is paella? The answer, from a Barcelona chef

course we are familiar with the Spanish rice dish paella, we say. It is the color of a Mediterranean sunrise, a coral red or saffron yellow. Chef Rosa Camprodon shakes her head. Or maybe that's a shudder. She is our instructor at a Barcelona cooking school that caters to tourists, and she is teaching us to make paella Catalonia-style: a rich coppery brown.

Camprodon tosses finely diced onion into a pan of hot olive oil and has one student stir it. Add the tomato, and stir. Never let it sit on the flame, she says. Never let it burn. Add rice and stir 15 minutes in all, or until the mixture is a deep brown, ready for other ingredients. "There are as many paellas as there are cooks," Camprodon says. "But paella is not red or yellow. It is brown. The darkness depends on how long you caramelize the onions in their own natural sugar."

Chefs are nothing if not opinionated about food. And food, like art or history, is a great gateway into a new place. So on our first trip to Barcelona, my husband and I signed up for a half-day class with the Cook and Taste school. But before we tackled the paella, we spent a few hours on the history, gathering food for thought on a group walking tour about the Spanish Civil War. Our guide, Nick Lloyd, met us in the morning near La Rambla and La Boqueria market as tourists and foodies began to pour in. But he took us back to a time when the city was draped in red and black flags, with workers armed for battle. Here in the 1930s, he explained, followers of "Karl Marx, Adam Smith and the anarchists" joined forces in a revolutionary government in Catalonia, to fight against the fascists led by Gen. Francisco Franco - before turning on each other.

Lloyd pointed out a building once occupied by anarchists, across the plaza from another occupied by communists, and down La Ramba to the hotel where George Orwell stayed when he joined other volunteers who came to Spain from around the world to fight Franco. Lloyd recited passages from Orwell's "Homage to Catalonia" by heart, and explained that the war was a prelude to World War II. Franco crushed Barcelona's revolutionary government when his forces took the city in 1939, and he ruled the country with an iron fist until his death in 1975. It took decades for Barcelona to recover, but today the city is a bustling cosmopolitan center, known not so much for its bloody past and revolutionary struggles as for, among other things, Gaudi, soccer and of course, food.

The city's cuisine gained international fame in part thanks to the innovative chef Ferran Adria.

His El Bulli restaurant closed in 2011 but his influence remains. And maybe that's why we even thought to take a cooking class. The menu at Cook and Taste was gazpacho, roasted vegetables and cod over flatbread, seafood paella and, for dessert, crema Catalana. Our diverse group of 12 from the US, Singapore and Australia had much to learn and eat in four hours: The ham must be room temperature so the fat melts over the meat to bring out the flavor. The cockles for the paella should be cleaned in cold water with salt "so it feels like home," Camprodon said. The mussels, well, "they are very sociable, you know," so you must remove the thin beard-like membrane they use to cling to each other and to rocks. We prepared dessert first so it would have time to chill. One group whisked egg yolks and milk infused with lemon peel and cinnamon. The scented mixture was poured into terracotta dishes and refrigerated.

Another group diced and blended gazpacho, using the traditional tomato, cucumber, green pepper and garlic along with unusual ingredients: watermelon and beets. Camprodon prepared flatbread dough ahead, so it could rise before baking. We roasted eggplant, onions and red pepper, peeled the peppers and cut the vegetables into strips before boiling the cod in hot olive oil with garlic and cavenne. The bread was cut into squares and layered with vegetables

Finally, the paella. "This is a social event. We make it on Sundays with kids everywhere and sometime people fight, 'No, I make the best paella, I do it better...' but there is plenty for everyone to do. This is hard work," Camprodon explained. We took turns stirring onions, added vegetables, rice and a saffron-garlic paste, then spread it evenly in a pan. "No empty spaces please," Camprodon said. She added plenty of salt but not as much as locals seem to like. Cockles, mussels and shrimp were laid on top, then fish stock was poured into the pan and brought to a boil. "Another rule of paella: Never, ever stir after the stock has been added," she said. "Ideally, the rice is a little al dente." We ate gazpacho and flatbread as the paella cooked. At last, it was ready, as delicious as it looked. We savored the flavors but left room for the finale: our Catalan dessert, topped by sugar caramelized with a kitchen blow torch. We left sated, educated and ready for a siesta. — AP

# Summertime herbs make

# versatile herbed yogurt cheese

f there's ever a time when you can have too much of a good thing, it might be right now, when fresh summertime herbs are beyond abundant. Happily, this recipe for Fresh Herbed Yogurt Cheese is just the ticket when you're looking to put a dent in the stockpile of herbs overflowing in your garden or taking up too much space in your refrigerator. It's a fresh cheese based on Greek yogurt, and it's very flexible regarding its herbal flavorings. I've chosen some of my favorites, including chives, parsley, thyme and tarragon. But if you have other herbs at hand - basil, cilantro, mint, oregano go right ahead and swap them in for my mix.

Whichever herbs you use, be sure to chop them with a supersharp knife, and do so briefly and efficiently. Whacking away at herbs endlessly with a dull knife guarantees that you'll end up with a wet, gray mess. Making this cheese is simple, but you need to plan ahead because the yogurt takes 48 hours to drain. And although you're welcome to dig into it right after you've added the herbs, it tastes much better if you let it chill overnight. Plus, it's easier then to shape the cheese

into a log or a round. As an appetizer, this spread is delicious served on toasted French bread rounds or your favorite crackers. It's also great in place of mustard or mayonnaise on a summer sandwich of sliced turkey, smoked salmon, or roast beef - or on veggie sandwiches starring cucumbers or tomatoes. However you use this cheese, you'll be glad to have put the season's herbs to good use.

### Fresh herbed yogurt cheese

Start to finish: 2 1/2 days plus 20 minutes (20 active)

- 17.6 ounce container (about 2 cups) Greek yogurt, full-fat
- or low-fat, your choice 3 tablespoons minced shallot
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh parsley

1 tablespoon minced fresh chives 2 teaspoons minced fresh tarragon

1 1/2 teaspoons minced garlic 1 teaspoon minced fresh thyme 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

Salt and black pepper Toasted baguette slices or crackers

Line a large strainer with a triple layer of rinsed and squeezed cheesecloth and set the strainer over a larger bowl. Pile the yogurt into the strainer, spreading it out. Cover with plastic wrap, top with a plate and a weight such as a can of tomatoes and let the yogurt drain in the refrigerator for 48

Transfer the drained yogurt to a bowl and stir in the next 7 ingredients. Add salt and pepper to taste. If time permits, cover and chill the cheese for up to 8 hours (to develop the flavor). Shape the cheese into logs or rounds and serve with toasted baguette slices or crackers. Makes a little over 2 cups.

# Taking green bean salad up a notch

reen beans can be - well, I'll say it, boring. They are one of the most accessible and affordable vegetables on the market, and one of the easiest to prepare, but too often they bring to mind the word "meh." But green beans can lend themselves to so many different kinds of preparations and seasonings that there are lots of reasons to make the effort to take them to another level. They can be roasted, steamed, boiled and sauteed, or served at room temperature in a salad, as in this recipe.

Here they are paired with bright, tangy clementine oranges and salty feta, then lifted up another notch with minced shallots and fresh thyme leaves. If you don't have coarse Dijon you can use regular, though I like the extra texture that the coarse variety gives to the dressing. The beans can be cooked and tossed with the dressing up to two days ahead, which lets them marinate a bit. Add the oranges and feta just before serving. All in all, a far cry from "meh."

### **Green bean salad with** clementine oranges and feta

Start to finish: 20 minutes Servings: 6

- 1 1/2 pounds green beans
- 3 clementines
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons rice vinegar 2 tablespoons minced shallots
- 1 tablespoon coarse Dijon mustard 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste 1 cup crumbled feta

Bring a large pot of generously salted water to a boil. Drop the beans into the water and let them cook for 3 minutes until they start to become tender. Drain the beans in a colander and run cold water over them to stop the cooking, cool them down and preserve the bright green color. Peel the clementines and cut each segment in half crosswise. Cut the cooled beans in half cross-wise.

In a small bowl or container, combine the olive oil, vinegar, shallots, mustard, thyme, salt and pepper. Whisk or shake to combine. Place the beans and orange segments in a large bowl and drizzle the dressing over them. Toss to combine thoroughly. Add 1/2 cup of the feta and toss again gently to combine, then sprinkle the rest of the feta on top. Serve at room temperature or chilled.

# 'Pete's Dragon' (pleasantly) stays earthbound

fter an exhausting summer buffet of set pieces, superheroes and whatever s-word you might use for "Suicide Squad," the gentle "Pete's Dragon" is a welcome palate cleanser. Where other summer movies are chest-thumping, it's quiet; where others are brashly cynical, it's sweetly sincere; where others are lacking in giant cuddly dragons, "Pete's Dragon" has one. Few may remember the 1977 Disney original, in which a young boy's best friend was a bubbly dragon invisible to others. As part of Disney's continuing effort to remake its animated classics in live-action, "Pete's Dragon" has been confidently reborn as an earnest tale of green-winged wonder.

David Lowery, a veteran of the independent film world and the director of the lyrical crime drama "Ain't Them Bodies Saints," inherits a far bigger film. But his "Pete's Dragon" still maintains the homespun feel of an American fable. Spielberglight, you might call it. The film begins, in the "Bambi" tradition, in parental tragedy. Pete's family is driving through a remote Pacific Northwest forest with Pete nestled in the backseat of the station wagon, reading a children's book about a dog named Elliott. A deer sprints out and, in poetic slowmotion, the gravity of the car's interior is upended. The car flips off the road and Pete staggers from the crash.

Flashing forward six years, Pete (Oakes Fegley) is a wild 10year-old orphan living in the woods alone except for his magical companion, the dragon Elliott. As far as CGI creatures go, Elliott is an irresistible one. Furry as a fairway, he's like an enormous emerald-green puppy. Far from the "Game of Thrones" dragon variety, he's more adept at chasing his own tail than breathing fire. He's also the subject of local folklore, mostly as told by Robert Redford's wood-carving storyteller.

### Magic and family and faith

But it's his forest ranger daughter Grace (Bryce Dallas Howard) that first encounters Elliott and ultimately leads to the dragon's discovery. Grace coaxes Elliott back into society and into the fold of her family. She has a daughter, Natalie (Oona Laurence) and lumber mill-running husband Jack (Wes Bentley). It's the push by a logging company - where Jack's brother, Gavin (Karl Urban) is a gun-totting lumberjack - into the forest that simultaneously begins flushing out Pete and Elliott from their home in the trees. The lush forest (New

Zealand, again, subbing for North America) reigns over "Pete's Dragon," a tale scored with soft bluegrass and exuding an environment-friendly love for the beautiful and exotic splendors of nature. When competing interests come for Elliott, they are really fighting for the soul of the forest.

There are Spielbergian gestures here of magic and family and faith, perhaps better orchestrated than Spielberg's own recent try at a Disney film, "The BFG." But it's missing a spark, a sense of danger and maybe a little humor. The lean simplicity of "Pete's Dragon" is its greatest attribute and its weakness. It doesn't quite achieve liftoff until the film's final moments. But it does at last catch flight, finally soaring beyond its humble folksiness. "Pete's Dragon," a Walt Disney Co release, is rated PG by the Motion Picture Association of America for "action, peril and brief language." Running time: 103 minutes. Three stars out of four. — AP

# Florence Foster Jenkins: Tone-deaf but adored

hen opera lovers ask New York's Carnegie Hall for souvenir concert programs, they're not usually interested in Maria Callas or Joan Sutherland. More often than not, the name they request is Florence Foster Jenkins, an American socialite who only appeared at the legendary venue once, and couldn't hold a note. "In order for a singer to succeed, they need to have a combination of talent, charisma, and interpretive quality," Carnegie's archives director Gino Francesconi wrote in a blogpost commemorating her life.

"And, by definition, they need to be able to sing. Florence Foster Jenkins had none of these attributes. In fact, she was considered one of the worst singers of all time." Jenkins, who craved fame as a diva but gained infamy for her terrible voice, is the subject of "Florence Foster Jenkins," a bittersweet biopic which hits US theaters this week, starring three-time Oscar winner Meryl Streep and Hugh Grant. "She almost gets it, and that's what I found delicious in her," Streep told the audience at a preview screening for the Paramount picture in Beverly Hills last week.

"I started listening to the recordings and I could feel her getting really excited and her thinking 'This is going very well," said the actress. Jenkins, who inherited a fortune from her father in 1909, had to give up her beloved piano due to nerve damage from syphilis contracted from her first husband when she was just a teenager. She used her wealth to indulge her passion for opera singing instead, putting on grand artistic soirees for polite society at the Ritz-Carlton, the Waldorf and other upscale Manhattan venues.

### 'Vanity'

Those who heard her-often acquaintances rather than paying members of the public-knew she was a terrible singer but none ever felt inclined to tell her. "It became a thing to do. You had to go and listen to Florence Foster screw up every song she attempted to sing," says Francesconi. She was persuaded to make her Carnegie Hall debut at the age of 76 on October 25, 1944 and walked onstage in flamboyant homemade costumes, throwing roses into the sell-out crowd. The concert went as poorly as had every other recital, but this time Jenkins was not among friends.

Henry Simon of the daily newspaper PM described the audience's laughter as "the cruelest and least civilized behavior I have ever witnessed in Carnegie Hall." But a less charitable write-up in the Los Angeles Times described the performance as the "most pathetic exhibition of vanity I have ever seen." The singer's common-law husband, failed Shakespearean actor St Clair Bayfield hadn't approved of the concert, and wrote after her death that it had "turned out the fiasco I expected." "Afterward, when we went home, Florence was upset-and when she read the reviews, crushed. She had not known, you see," he added.

Diagnosed with heart strain, she died a month later. Directed by Stephen Frears ("Philomena," "The Queen"), the movie was shot in London and Liverpool, a city in northwestern England whose architecture is said to resemble that of 1940s Manhattan.

### 'Funny and moving'

"I thought it was a very special kind of gift, an adventure, to look into the life of someone who had no understanding of how she presented, except to hope that it went well," said Streep, 67. Grant-whose acting had taken a back seat to campaigning in Britain for tighter regulation of the country's famously rowdy tabloid press-was in semi-retirement, "having a baby a week, basically," when he was asked to play Bayfield.

"Stephen, who I knew a bit through the politics, started to make noises about a film. I thought he was joking and then suddenly this script appeared on my desk from him," said the actor, who has fathered four children since turning 50. "Not only was it funny and moving, but it was also directed by himhe's quite classy-and Meryl bloody Streep was going to be in it so I absolutely had to say yes."—AFP

he Exorcist" TV series that Fox will unveil this fall takes place in the same universe occupied by the iconic William Friedkin film, producers said at the Television Critics Association panel for the show. "It was important to let everyone know that this is a continuation of an existing story," said Slater. Those acknowledgements are in the first episode, and they're there in part to indicate that decades have passed, and audience members should not expect Fathers Karras and Merrin to "show up" at the home of the Rance family, whose plight occupies much of the ten-episode first season.

### **Evil insinuating**

Slater, Wyatt and the cast noted that one of their biggest goals was to carry over the grounded tone and realistic atmosphere of the first "Exorcist" film. Wyatt, who directed the pilot, noted that Friedkin had a background in documentary film before helming feature films. "He was approaching it as an agnostic or as an ambivalent [person] — the notion of evil insinuating itself into a situation, and whether that is demonic possession or part of the psychological makeup of the person," Wyatt said. "That's part of what made it wholly terrifying-that it was so plausible." "I believe there is evil in the world and we have certainly seen instances of it historically, and currently," said Geena Davis, who plays Angela Rance in the drama. "I think everyone is capable of an extreme range of behaviors,

depending on what you're exposed to and what vour character can resist."

Davis, the founder of the Geena Davis Institute on Gender in Media, noted that the producers were well aware of the extensive work she has done to combat sexist Hollywood practices and stereotypes in the media. "When I was first approached, they were very earnest about letting me know" that they wanted her feedback and input, Davis said. Half the show's writers and two of its directors are women, she noted, and she also said that the arcs of the female characters were, in many ways, the dominant parts of

### Twists and turns

"I haven't really had to bust anybody on anything," she said. "I think they're going out of their way so that I can be extremely proud of the show." Though it shares many aspects of the original-a family in crisis and priests who attempt to help-this version of "The Exorcist" will layer in the building blocks of a mythology that, in theory, would allow the show to run for some time. "This time around, evil has grander ambitions than targeting an eight-year-old girl in Georgetown," Slater said. Though this bigger story structure will be constructed around the Vances, the family and their relationships will remain the entry points for the audience.

"You need the propulsive twists and turns, and we have plenty of big plot twists, but at the end of the day, it's always going to be about a family in trouble and the priests brought in to help them," Slater said. If audiences didn't become involved in the characters, "we haven't done our jobs." There are scares, Slater said, but it's not a show that will deliver lots of gore every week. "We're learning a lot about what you can and can't accomplish on a TV budget," Slater said. "You have to be very judicious and smart about when you use your scares-you don't want to numb the audience. ... The audience knows the horror is coming, and as long as their patience is rewarded, the pressure is to tell the best story possible, not to tell the most shocking or gratuitous story possible."—Reuters

# 'Game of Thrones' music tour coming to N America

■he creators of "Game of Thrones" are turning the blockbuster fantasy epic into a North American concert tour, bringing together both the music and new visuals from the series. The tour next year will focus on the score composed by Ramin Djawadi, who will present the music with a full orchestra and what producers promised to be innovative video technology. "By combining the music with state-ofthe-art technology, we are going to bring the astonishing world of Westeros to fans in a live and unique concert experience," the German-

born, half-Iranian composer said in a statement

## Cruise's 'Mena' pushed back, gets new title

om Cruise's cartel film "Mena" is now called "American Made," and is moving from Jan 6, 2017, to Sept 29, 2017, Universal Pictures announced on Monday. "American Made" is the latest collaboration between Cruise and director Doug Liman, who helmed the A-lister in "Edge of Tomorrow." "American Made" is based on the real-life exploits of Barry Seal, a hustler for drug kingpin Pablo Escobar and pilot unexpectedly recruited by the CIA to run one of the biggest covert operations in US history, one that almost brought down the Reagan White House through the Iran Contra scandal. Cruise, himself a trained pilot, plays Seal.

Related Pilot of Fatal Plane Crash Talked About Danger of Shooting Films (VIDEO) Imagine Entertainment's Brian Grazer, Cross Creek Pictures' Brian Oliver and Tyler Thompson, Quadrant Pictures' Doug Davison and Kim Roth are producing. Cross Creek Pictures is financing the film, with Universal handling distribution. The film generated headlines last year, when a plane carrying crew members crashed on the set in Colombia in September 2015, killing two people and seriously injuring a third person. Local authorities believe that bad weather caused the twin-engine Aerostar to crash. Cruise was in production on the movie at the time of the incident, but was not on the plane. The two people killed were identified as American film pilot Alan David Purwin and Colombian Carlos Berl. — Reuters

# Okinawa's snakeskin banjo stands test of time

normous python skins hang from a wire inside the sweltering workshop where Seibun Nakamine sculpts ■a piece of Okinawa's musical identity. They are essential for the wiry 69-year-old craftsman who has spent nearly half a century making the three-stringed sanshin. The snakeskin-covered instrument, similar to a banjo, sits at the heart of the sub-tropical island chain's rich musical history. Its contagious, twangy sound is a fixture at weddings, festivals, and other celebrations.

Sitting on the wooden floor of his tiny studio, a pair of huge ox horns on the wall above, Nakamine sees his work as much more than assembling an instrument which can take several weeks to make and cost as much as \$5,000. Crafting a sanshin-which means three strings in Japanesefrom ebony wood is like giving birth to a child, he said. "When I sell them to musicians, I feel like I am marrying off my daughter," Nakamine said.

"The art of making the sanshin is based on really old customs. It's complex, but very exciting to do. "It's my job to figure out how to craft its body from the middle with the best possible balance and in the most beautiful way," he added. Nakamine-who has already chosen the sanshin music to be played at his funeral-is part of a dying breed. He estimates there are only about 50 professional sanshin makers left in Okinawa these days. The archipelago, which sits about 650 kilometers (400 miles) southwest of the Japanese mainland, was once home to the independent Ryukyu kingdom until it was annexed by Tokyo in the late 1800s.

For hundreds of years before that, Okinawa had strong ks with China where a similar three-stringed instrument. the sanxian, served as a model for what would become the sanshin and, later, the Japanese shamisen. Okinawa, the scene of some of World War II's heaviest fighting, became a US colony after Japan's surrender in 1945. It was returned to Tokyo's control in the early seventies.

### 'Shadow warriors'


During the tough post-war years, some Okinawans resorted to a makeshift version of the instrument made out of a piece of wood and tin can. "Playing the sanshin was a comfort and helped to relieve the stress," said musician Tatsuo Chinen at a bar in the capital city Naha that specializes in sanshin music. But Chinen thinks the sanshin is not only an instrument of the past. "There are many young people who are now interested in this instrument," he added. For many though, the sanshin remains a powerful reminder of Okinawa's history, and its soulful sound can mirror a vast range of emotions, from intense sadness to bubbling joy.



Sometimes that joy translates into islanders opting to play sanshin music or listening to a performance-instead of working, Nakamine joked. "It's my opinion, but if you ask me, Okinawans like fooling around," he says. The sanshin has now crossed over into other more pop and rock-like musical styles among Okinawan bands. And so Nakamine tries to match what he creates to the voice and musical style of his clients. "If you try to determine the sanshin's sound when it's done being made, you're already too late,"

"That won't answer a customer's needs." The craftsman's sun-wrinkled hands are a hot commodity and his order backlog can sometimes stretch back more than 10 months. But it's not his opinion of the work that counts most, Nakamine said. "The musician judges whether a sanshin is good or bad," he said. "As craftsmen, we do our best to make a great instrument. But in the end we're only (working) in the shadow of the musician. "We're shadow war-

# Escape rooms get an upgrade into a deeper theatrical show

Manhattan skyscraper. You're handed a form on a clipboard. Then the receptionist slips away and the doors lock and all hell breaks loose. Within an hour, you and your group will have searched for clues in drawers and bookcases to get free, crawled through a ventilation shaft and encountered a woman dangling from a meat hook. "Paradiso: Chapter 1" fuses the traditional escape room game with theatrical elements like actors and high-tech production values.

"Paradiso" is one of several shows pushing the boundaries of what escape rooms can become, turning the fast-growing games into a richer, theatrical experience. "It seemed like there was an opportunity for escape rooms to go to the next level," said Michael Counts, the creator and one of the early pioneers of immersive theater. "For us, it was creating a deeper narrative, something that was expansive." Escape rooms were invented in Japan. They first appeared in the US in 2014. There are

according to the online Escape Room Directory.


"Maybe 'escape game' is a very limited word to use," said John Hennessy, one of the first to embrace the trend in the US "I think we're going to have to start calling them something different." Hennessy, who organized races and scavenger hunts around southern California, now runs four escape rooms, including ones set in a medieval alchemist's lab and a film-noir style Hollywood mystery. "People spend their days pretty much staring at a screen - a monitor or a telephone, or whatever. This is very different from that. You're faced with problems that you have to solve by talking to each other and working with other people," he said.

### 'The Walking Dead Experience'

Counts teamed up with producer Jennifer Worthington, a former executive with filmmaker Jerry Bruckheimer, to create "Paradiso." To go deeper and scarier, they hired Broadway and immersive theater veterans - including lighting designer Ryan O'Gara from "Hamilton," video and special effects wizard Caleb Sharp from "The Walking Dead Experience" and set designer Katie Fleming of "Sleep No More." Ten guests at a time begin in the reception of the Virgil Corp., a nefarious Halliburton-like contractor. The cost is \$60, more than double the price of most regular escape rooms, but the experience is virtually cinematic.

The game is a noisy, chaotic, adrenalin-pumping scramble through four rooms. Doorknobs must be yanked in the darkness, peepholes in doors show scary figures, video screens flash messages, and there are holographic helicopters and corpses split in half - all to a doom-inducing soundscape." You're sort of dropped into an action movie," said Worthington. "Who doesn't want to be in the middle of a James Bond movie?" In Orlando, Florida, Dave Maynard and his team at Digital Escape Velocity have added multi-touch screens, projectors, mobile devices and robotics. "We have gone completely off the deep end when it comes to throwing really high-tech stuff at it," Maynard said.

Maynard and his four teammates - all veterans of Lockheed Martin's research and development lab - just opened their first room, a deep space adventure set in 2225 that's customizable with the touch of a button. Six players at a time start in the battle-scarred engineering room of an alien ship and figure out how to power up the spacecraft and get to the observation deck and later the bridge. Wristbands offer players status updates, lights and engine sounds are synched up, video clues are sent depending on need and metrics are kept for a high scoreboard. "We innovate by really looking at how do we take the best of one thing and the best of another thing, put it together and make something that no one's ever seen before," said Maynard. — AP

# Artwork from comedian Garry Shandling's estate to be sold

ozens of paintings and other works of art from the estate of comedian Garry Shandling will be offered for sale at a show in New Mexico this week. Organizers of the annual Objects of Art Santa Fe say this will be the first public viewing of Shandling's collection, which includes Navajo rugs, Southwest furniture and pieces by Mexican artists Francisco Zuniga and Alfredo Ramos

More than 40 of Shandling's personal pieces from his California home will be offered, ranging from a couple hundred dollars to more than \$40,000. The 66-year-old comedian, who died in March, stopped in Santa Fe often to vacation and buy art. Some of the pieces up for sale were originally purchased in Santa Fe, and it was through the recommendations of family and friends in California and relationships among art dealers that the pieces are finding their way back to New Mexico's art capital.

"Obviously Garry enjoyed the Southwest and enjoyed Santa Fe and this style of work so it was an exciting combination that we were doing the Objects show at the same time that they were ready to release the collection," said Kim Martindale, a co-producer of the show. Shandling was raised in Tucson, Arizona. On arriving in Los Angeles as a young adult, it was a short hop from a brief stint in the advertising business to comedy writing and stand-up.

While he was best known for his punchlines, his love of art resulted in regular appearances at the annual LA Art Show. "He definitely was a collector. He definitely was involved in the art world but he wasn't super public about that," Martindale said. "He certainly had a house full of really nice paintings and furniture and Navajo textiles." Among the work at this week's Objects show is a \$43,000 modernist painting of nuns on newsprint by Ramos Martinez that dates back to 1943. The artist began painting on paper in Paris and contin-

ued after moving to Los Angeles. Martindale said Shandling's collection is reflective of his affinity for the Southwest and the Mexican and Latin style. Aside from the comedian's collection, the show will also feature work by Mexican sculptor Betsabee Romero, Cuban artist Jose Bedia and other one-of-a-kind pieces from around the world. With the success of the show in Santa Fe over the last several years, organizers have plans to expand with a show in Los Angeles in April. This week's show opens Thursday with a gala in Santa Fe and runs through Sunday. — AP
