US ALARMED AS **TURKEY STRIKES KURDISH MILITIA**

ISTANBUL: Turkey warned yesterday it would carry out more strikes on a Syrian Kurdish militia if it failed to retreat beyond the Euphrates River, as Washington condemned their weekend clashes as "unacceptable". Turkish forces pressed on with a two-pronged operation inside Syria against Islamic State (IS) jihadists and the Syrian Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG), shelling over a dozen targets. But strikes against the YPG are hugely sensitive as the Kurdish group - seen as a terror group by Ankara - is allied with Turkey's NATO partner, the United States, in the fight against IS in Syria.

Ankara said it had killed 25 Kurdish "terrorists" in strikes on YPG positions on Sunday, a day after a Turkish soldier died in a rocket attack allegedly by the militia. The Pentagon called the clashes "unacceptable" and urged an immediate de-escalation. Turkey's operation aims to push the YPG back across the Euphrates River to prevent it joining up the region east of the river already under its control with a Kurdish-held area to the west.

Ankara fears the emergence of an autonomous Kurdish region in Syria would bolster Kurdish rebels across the border in southeast Turkey. US Vice President Joe Biden, visiting Ankara last week, said Continued on Page 13

KUWAIT: Authorities ordered police to seize the state's football association and Olympic committee offices. The action on Sunday heightened a standoff that has seen Kuwait suspended by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and world football's governing body FIFA since October. The country did not take part in this year's Rio Olympics and will not contest the qualifiers for football's 2018 World Cup.

As part of his keenness on the issue, HH the Amir yesterday received top officials of the two interim committees tasked with taking care of affairs at the Kuwait Olympic Committee (KOC) and the Kuwait Football Association (KFA). The Amir encouraged the officials to exert utmost efforts to promote the sports and youth sector in Kuwait, and to bring those who break the law

The move came after the government's sports commission ousted Sheikh Talal Fahd Al-Sabah as head of the KFA and KOC. Sheikh Fahd Jaber Al-Ali has been named as the new head of the Olympic committee. Fawaz Al-Hassawi, who was named as new head of the football association, is the owner of English Championship side Nottingham Forest. Police seized the offices of the football association but failed to take over the Olympic committee headquarters.

At a press conference after the football offices were seized, Hassawi promised increased prizes in the Kuwaiti championship. However, the ousted head said authorities had used "threat and intimidation" in an official notice demanding that the KFA offices be handed over. Sheikh Talal, in a statement released by KFA, said he had been accused of "financial violations", over which he demanded an investigation by Kuwaiti prosecutors.

IS ATTACK KILLS 71 IN YEMEN

ADEN: An Islamic State group militant torn country. rammed his explosives-laden car into an army recruiting center in Aden yesterday, killing 71 people in the deadliest jihadist attack on the Yemeni city in over a year. The army, supported by a Saudiled coalition, is training young recruits to join its nationwide war against Houthi rebels and their allies, as well as other militants. Aden is the temporary base of Yemen's internationally recognized government, which was forced into exile after Iran-backed insurgents

Security officials told AFP the attacker drove the car bomb into a gathering of recruits at a school in the north of the port city. The recruits were among 5,000 newly enrolled soldiers being trained to fight the Houthi rebels in the north along the border with Saudi Arabia, military sources said. Although the complex was locked as recruits registered inside, the attacker drove in when the gate was opened for a delivery vehicle, officials said.

UZBEK PRESIDENT HOSPITALIZED AFTER BRAIN HEMORRHAGE

MOSCOW: Strongman Uzbek President Islam Karimov, who has dominated the Central Asian nation for over 25 years, is in intensive care after suffering a brain hemorrhage, his younger daughter said yesterday. "My father was hospitalized after suffering a cerebral haemorrhage on Saturday morning, and is now receiv-

ing treatment in an intensive care unit," Lola Karimova-Tillyaeva, Uzbekistan's ambassador to UNESCO, wrote on Instagram of the 78-year-old leader. She added that "his condition is considered stable" but that "at the moment it is too early to make any predictions about his future health."

Karimov's press service on Sunday announced that the Central Asian leader - long dogged by rumors of ill health - had been hospitalized, without giving details. The former Soviet apparatchik, whose brutal crackdown on dissent has been widely criticized by rights groups, has been at the helm of the strategic country bordering Afghanistan from since before it gained independence from Moscow in 1991. The wily leader has played off Russia, China and the West against each other to ensure Uzbekistan avoided

COLOMBIA CEASEFIRE ENDS 52-YEAR WAR WITH FARC

BOGOTA: A historic ceasefire came into in Havana after nearly four years of talks. effect in Colombia yesterday, ending a 52year war between the FARC rebels and the government that claimed more than 250,000 lives. The full ceasefire ordered by President Juan Manuel Santos and the head of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC), Timoleon Jimenez, began at midnight (0500 GMT yesterday). "This August 29 a new phase of history begins for Colombia. We silenced the guns. THE WAR WITH THE FARC IS OVER!" Santos wrote on Twitter one minute after midnight. A message from the official FARC account at the same time was more restrained: "From this moment on the bilateral and definitive ceasefire begins."

In a statement to reporters in Cuba, where peace talks were held, Jimenez said he had ordered all commanders and units "and each one of our combatants to definitively cease fire and hostilities against the Colombian state." Santos had issued similar orders Thursday to the Colombian military. The ceasefire is the first in which both sides are committed to a definite end to the fighting. "The ceasefire is really one more seal on the end of the conflict. It is the test of fire," said Carlos Alfonso Velazquez, a security expert at the University of La

The conflict began in 1964 with the launch of the FARC, a Marxist guerrilla group born out of a peasant uprising.

It has left 260,000 dead, 45,000 missing and 6.9 million uprooted from their homes. To end the war with the FARC for good, Colombians must now vote in an October 2 referendum on the peace accord reached Santos said the exact question that will be put to voters in the referendum would be announced "in the coming days". "We are on the verge of perhaps the most important political decision of our lives," he said in a speech on Saturday.

Opinion polls show Colombians are divided ahead of the referendum. Santos's top rival, former president Alvaro Uribe, is leading a campaign to vote "no" to the peace deal. He says a special justice system envisaged for crimes committed during the conflict would give FARC fighters impunity. Opponents question the FARC's commitment to peace. "I don't think we can believe them," said Felipe Giraldo, a 25year-old unemployed man in Bogota. Others have a high personal stake in the vote. Adelaida Bermudez, 50, hopes it will bring home her daughter, a FARC fighter for the past nine years. "I hope we'll have peace... so the children come home," she said in Gaitania, in the central region where the FARC was born.


Santos and Jimenez are due to sign the peace agreement sometime between Sept 20 and 30 - possibly at the United Nations General Assembly in New York, said Foreign Minister Maria Angela Holguin. The end of hostilities will be followed by a sixmonth demobilization process. Starting Monday, the FARC's estimated 7,500 fighters will head to collection points to surrender their weapons under UN supervision. Guerrillas who refuse to demobilize and disarm "will be pursued with all the strength of the state forces," Santos told El Espectador newspaper. — AFP

LIGHTNING KILLS 323

STOCKHOLM: More than 300 wild reindeer have been killed by lighting in central Norway. The Norwegian Environment Agency has released eerie images showing a jumble of reindeer carcasses scattered across a small area on the Hardangervidda mountain plateau. The agency says 323 animals were killed, including 70 calves, in the lightning storm Friday. Agency spokesman Kjartan Knutsen told AP it's not uncommon for reindeer or other wildlife to be killed by lightning strikes but this was an unusually deadly event.

"We have not heard about such numbers before," he said yesterday. He said reindeer tend to stay very close to each other in bad weather, which could explain how so many were killed at once. "I don't know if there were several lighting strikes," he said. "But it happened in one moment." Knutsen said the agency is now discussing what to do with the dead animals. Normally, they are just left where they are to let nature take its course, he said. Thousands of reindeer migrate across the barren Hardanangervidda plateau as the seasons change. — AP





KUWAIT ASPIRES TO JOIN INT'L SECURITIES COMMISSION

Cabinet examines measures to rehabilitate environment

KUWAIT: The Cabinet yesterday examined plans aimed at promoting Kuwait financial market and steps required to join the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO). The Government, during its weekly session, examined the fifth annual report about activities of the Capital Market Authority (CMA), presented by Minster of Commerce and Industry Dr Yousef Mohammad Al-Ali, outlining accomplished tasks for the 2015-2016 fiscal year, the CMA accounts, as well as a report by the auditor in charge of the accounts and financial statement (2015-2016).

The broad report envisages the CMA outlook for promoting international rating of Kuwait Stock Exchange (KSE) to be placed among emerging markets, as well as meeting the requirements to join the IOSCO, in line with the approach to stay abreast of most modern international rules and criteria applied in the securities markets for sake of retaining the Kuwaiti market regional leadership.

Rehabilitate environment

His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah on Monday chaired the regular Cabinet meeting at Bayan Palace. Following the session, Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs and Acting Foreign Minister Sheikh Mohammad Al-Abdullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah stated the session got started with the ministers examining a message addressed to His Highness the Amir from the King of Brunei, expressing satisfaction at his recent visit to the State of Kuwait, noting that it would contribute to cementing the ties between the two friendly country. Also in the session, the Deputy Prime Minister and Interior Minister Sheikh Mohammad Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah briefed the ministers about Sunday's visit to the country by the Qatari Prime Minister and Interior Minister Sheikh Abdullah bin Nasser bin Khalifa Al Thani, during which talks focused on security cooperation namely efforts in facing terrorism and extremism in the region.

Moreover, the Cabinet studied the regular report by the environment projects program for the period of time between April and June (2016). In this regard, Deputy Premier, Finance Minister, Acting Oil Minister and chairman of the board of the Kuwaiti liaison environmental projects center, Anas Al-Saleh, outlining measures that have been taken to rehabilitate the environment; adopted by the UN Compensations Commission, concerning the Ministry of Electricity and Water, Kuwait Oil Company (KOC) and the Public Authority for Agriculture and Fish Resources. Also in the same vein, minister Al-Saleh addressed the fellow executives about some main accomplishments and recommendations to speed up execution of some relevant projects.

Italy quake

Meanwhile, the Cabinet commiserated over a deadly earthquake in Italy, while it condemned an attack on the American University in the Afghan capital Kabul. The Cabinet conveyed its deepest sympathies and condolences for the people of Italy over the quake that killed scores of people and injured numerous others, as it wished swift recovery for those wounded in the quake.

Moreover, the Cabinet denounced the attack on the American University in Kabul that resulted in many fatalities and injuries. It also deplored the attack, describing it as a terrorist act that contravenes all religious and humanitarian values, as it urged the international community to ramp up efforts to exterminate the scourge of terrorism. —KUNA

26 STRATEGIC PROJECTS IN ANNUAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

GAS STATIONS READY FOR NEW TARIFFS

KUWAIT: The number of strategic projects in Kuwait's development plan for the 2016/2017 fiscal year reaches 26, with a total value of over KD 2 billion, or an average of KD 64 million for each venture, a government official said yesterday.

Kuwait is currently witnessing an era of executing a number of developmental projects, in addition to housing projects and others carried out through the public private partnership (PPP) module, said Hind Al-Subaih, Minister of Social Affairs and Labor and State Minister of Planning and

Meanwhile, Subaih said that there are six projects to be carried out by the Partnership Technical Bureau in the 2017/2018 fiscal year, with an estimated total value of KD 6 billion, which makes up nearly 25 percent of strategic projects' total cost. In addition, the same fiscal year includes one project for shareholding companies with an estimated value of KD 611 million. Therefore, projects to be carried out through the public private partnership and shareholding companies' concepts would make up 28 percent of strategic projects' total cost.

Annual development plans include several key projects such as the metro and railway project to be carried out as per the PPP concept, in addition to strategic projects in the health and education fields, Subaih added.

Gas stations closed

Gas stations around Kuwait will stop operations half an hour before midnight Wednesday, and will

resume work on the early hours of Thursday using the new tariffs for gasoline announced last month. The new prices, which officially become effective on September 1, are as follows: 85 fils for premium gasoline (42 percent increase), 105 for super gasoline (62 percent increase) and 165 fils for ultra gasoline (83 percent).

Price control

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Commerce and Industry is ready to implement its plan to monitor prices as soon as the new gasoline tariffs are implemented, said Eid Al-Rashidi, the Undersecretary Assistant for Commercial Control and Customer Protection Affairs. Ministry inspectors will tour markets around Kuwait in order to detect any cases in which prices are increased without valid reasons, Rashidi said. He urged consumers to contact the hotline: 135 in case they encounter any fabricated price increase incidents.

Labor protest

Around 200 workers employed by a major company demonstrated outside the Palace of Justice yesterday to demand monthly salaries they have not received in six months, according to their statements. The Asian laborers, whose average monthly salary reaches KD 70 each, said that they went to the Palace of Justice because they could not find anywhere else to demand their rights. The services' director at the Palace of Justice then met the workers and explained to them that the right place to make their complaint is the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor, so they walked there to file their grievance.

Five languages

Kuwait Human Rights Society released booklets containing the domestic helpers' law with all of its articles in five different languages: Arabic, English, Tagalog, Hindi and Urdu. The project was carried out in cooperation with the Dutch embassy in Kuwait. It was produced and distributed in cooperation with the Domestic Labor Department at the Interior Ministry, said Khaled Al-Humaidi, the society's chairman. The booklet is part of a series of publications that also include the labor law, and which aims at raising awareness among expatriate labor forces regarding their rights, Humaidi added.

Lower temperatures

Humidity levels are expected to drop before the weekend, while hot and dry weather with relatively lower temperatures during the night should prevail during the first week of September, veteran meteorologist Essa Ramadan said.

KAC PREPARES FOR HAJJ BY INCREASING FLIGHTS TO SAUDI

Carrier to transport 2.500 pilgrims from Kuwait. 3.000 from abroad

KUWAIT: As part of its preparations for the hajj season, Kuwait Airways Corporation (KAC) announced increasing the number of flights to Saudi Arabia during a press conference held yesterday at the KAC headquarters. The first flight for pilgrims departs today. KAC Regional Director Nasser Khoursheed said the hajj schedule that includes the additional flights will end on Sept 15, 2016. "This year there are 2,500 pilgrims from Kuwait in addition to 3,000 pilgrims from abroad flying onboard Kuwait Airways. This is the first time we have pilgrims from Germany. KAC has set attractive prices for tickets for the hajj season," he noted during the conference.

Bader Al-Shayea, director of the passports department, advised passengers to check the validity of their passports and civil IDs. "After the GCC meeting, it was recommended to travel with the passport instead of the civil ID, but it's not obligatory. We also advise passengers to make sure they don't have a travel ban before coming to the airport. Also, some people rush to the airport without noticing they have taken the passport of another family member," he said.

Hajj permit

Roumi Al-Roumi, head of the hajj and umrah committee at the Ministry of Awqaf, highlighted the fact that no pilgrim is allowed to leave without a hajj permit. "Expats should have a hajj visa and Kuwaitis should have the hajj permit with them. Otherwise, the pilgrim will be forced to return on the same flight back. I would also like to remind passengers to come on time, take care of their travel documents and cooperate with the organizers of the hajj campaigns," he pointed out.

Sulaiman Al-Humaidan, representative of the director general of airport security and head of building security, said new gates were set up especially for this season. "Although there will be more gates open, passengers should still come early to the airport as it's the high season. We are present at the airport to serve pilgrims 24/7," he noted.

Mohammed Al-Shatti, from the Civil Aviation Department, said special brochures were printed and will be distributed to pilgrims at the airport that include instructions and advice for pilgrims. He also advised people to limit the number of friends and families seeing off or welcoming pilgrims to avoid overcrowding. Maziad Al-Mutairi, director of the airport, stressed that this year pilgrims will collect their luggage at the airport instead of the cargo area, which was the case in previous years.

In brief

Juveniles' crimes up 122 percent

KUWAIT: Thefts remain the most committed type of crime committed in Kuwait, according to official statistics. A total of 934 theft crimes were committed during the first half of 2016, according to statistics released by the public prosecution for crimes investigated during that period. It is followed by drug and alcohol related crimes (927), murder and battery assault (360), sexual assault (175) and kidnap (139). Meanwhile, the same statistics show that juveniles' crimes have increased by 122 percent, as 1,399 were committed during the first half of 2016 compared to only 617 committed last year. Meanwhile, information technology crimes came in second place among misdemeanor crimes with 1,171 crimes, which is a high rate considering that the cybercrime law went into effect in January of this year. The public prosecution investigated in a total of 7,868 during the first half of 2016, out of which 4,281 were referred to court while 3,012 (40 percent) cases were shelved. —Al-Qabas

Gas stations ready

KUWAIT: Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC) informed the Finance Ministry that all preparations to start enforcing the new gasoline tariffs by Thursday are finished to guarantee the same level of efficiency at gas stations, sources said. In the meantime, car sale agencies recorded a notable increase in the sale of small-size vehicles compared to a drop in the sale of vehicles that have higher fuel consumption levels. Meanwhile, most taxi drivers say that fares are expected to increase after the gas price's hike becomes effective. — Al-Jarida

VAT delayed


KUWAIT: The value added tax (VAT) proposal which is included in the state's economic reform program has been delayed, said sources, adding that the government has dropped plans to present a draft law on that regard next October. Instead, the government will wait until a decision on that regard is issued by the Gulf Cooperation Council, the sources added. — Al-Anbaa

Drivers' ban

KUWAIT: The Interior Ministry has reactivated a law under which expatriates who leave Kuwait after working there as mandoubs (company representatives) or drivers are not allowed to return back to the country unless after two years from the exit date. The decision comes after the ministry detected manipulation in which an employee would agree with his employer to be hired as a representative or driver in order to get an exception to obtain a driver's license. The employee would then leave the country and come back later for another job while retaining their licenses, the sources explained. — Al-Anbaa

Rents going down?

KUWAIT: The successful housing plan in which a large number of units were distributed and power was connected in new cities such as the Jaber Al-Ahmad area is expected to lead to further drop in apartments' rents in Kuwait, said high ranking sources at the Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW). This factor coupled with others including the drop in oil prices as well as supply and demand has led to notable reduction in the real estate market's inflation, said the sources. —Al-Rai

FAKE DOCTOR ARRESTED

KUWAIT: A Bangladeshi man who arrived in Kuwait on a cleaner's visa acted as a doctor in Rabiya. The man, identified as 'Atwa', became famous very quickly among his compatriots and others, including women who got pregnant out of wedlock. They used to go to him for abortion pills, and he had large quantities of stolen medicine from health centers and hospitals, along with other drugs from unknown sources. Atwa was thinking about moving somewhere else, but tips were received by Farwaniya police, who placed him under surveillance for five days, then his place was raided and he was caught red-handed practicing medicine without a license. A huge amount of medicine, ampules, hormones and expired medicines were found. Atwa was arrested and is awaiting legal action

False alarm

"Please help, a Daeshi wants to blow up the mosque!" a citizen told police, who rushed to the scene and found that the so-called IS member was the mosque's muezzin who was throwing trash in a container. A security source said a call was received by Interior Ministry operations from a citizen in Qairawan asking for help against a man who was "circling the mosque to plant a bomb". The call was taken seriously, and police went to the mosque and asked the man to give himself up. The muezzin told police he was checking the surroundings of the mosque as he does every day at dawn.

Murder threat

"If I see you in the street, I will run you over," a citizen told his ex-wife. She took his threats seriously and lodged a complaint. The citizen, in her 30s, told Bayan police that she received a call from her ex-husband that included insults and the threat to kill her. Police are working on the case.

Drunk man arrested

A citizen, who was drunk, moved from his hotel to an adjacent hotel through the beach and started flirting with women, which landed him at a Salmiya police station. The citizen, who booked a room in a seaside hotel, drank liquor, then decided to change his hotel in his own way. He then started harassing women, and one of them called the hotel's management. The manager asked the harasser about his room number, but he was not able to speak properly and it was discovered he was not a guest. Police were called, who arrested the infiltrator and detained him for legal action.

Man detained for selling contrabands

A citizen brashly offered 'sexual' products on social media, so detectives arrested and charged him with selling pornographic material and inciting vice. A video clip showed a man promoting pornographic material for sale on social media, and he appeared promising a woman, who he claimed called him, to deliver what she ordered, and said he can provide her with what she needs. Detectives arrested the man in Hawally, and he confessed and handed over the pornographic material he was promoting

Driver mugged

ISLAMIC STATE 'CONNECTED' TO BANGLADESH

US OFFERS INTELLIGENCE, LAW-ENFORCEMENT HELP

DHAKA: The United States believes that elements of Islamic State are "connected" to operatives in Bangladesh, Secretary of State John Kerry said yesterday, promising help with intelligence and law enforcement after a wave of militant attacks. Kerry's blunt statement followed the July 1 attack on a cafe in an upscale district of the Bangladeshi capital, Dhaka, in which 22 people were killed mostly non-Muslims and foreigners, including one

It directly contradicted the narrative of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's government, which has blamed homegrown militants and denied a foreign hand in the hostage taking at the Holey Artisan Bakery that was claimed by Islamic State. The cafe raid was the most shocking of a series of atrocities that has included killings of atheist intellectuals, people from religious and sexual minorities and foreigners, raising fears over the stability of the mainly Muslim nation of 160 million.

Responding to questions after giving a speech, Kerry said he had a "very candid" conversation with Hasina. He said that Islamic State had wide contacts around the world, including in South Asia, adding: "They are connected to some degree with some of the operatives here, and we made that very clear in our conversations." As Kerry's motorcade headed to the US embassy for meetings with opposition leaders, a government minister directly contradicted him. "I told him that there is no such terrorist or militants from outside or who are connected with the (Islamic State), but there are militants inside our country and they are homegrown," Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan told Reuters.

'Eye off the ball'

Bangladesh's secular government has continued to enjoy the West's support despite mounting concerns over its handling of the escalation in militant activity. Bangladesh's security response has, say analysts, been colored by a political standoff with the Islamist-leaning opposition that boycotted the last general election and is suspected by the government of links to local militant groups. Michael Kugelman of The Wilson Center, a Washington-based think tank, said the US administration had not paid enough attention to the growing terror threats in Bangladesh, which is now impacting Americans. "It has arguably taken its eye off the ball even as this threat has begun to directly affect Americans," he said.

Police believe that Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh, a local militant group that has pledged allegiance to Islamic State, was involved in organizing in the cafe attack. Two days before Kerry's visit, security forces said they had killed three militants, including a Bangladeshi-born Canadian citizen called Tamim Ahmed Chowdhury who was suspected of being the mastermind. Chowdhury is reported to have been the subject of a profile in an Islamic State journal called Dabiq that identified him as its top operative in Bangladesh. The Syria-based militant group also published "selfie" photos of the cafe attackers on its propaganda channels while the hostage crisis was continuing.

Security cooperation

Kerry said "there is much we can do to cooperate" in the fields of intelligence and law enforcement to address security threats from both domestic and trans-national organizations. "That's the nature of the beast that we are dealing with today," Kerry said. "I'm absolutely confident that we will build additional capacity and it will be effective." In a speech, Kerry also touched on the need to uphold democratic principles "to defeat terrorists" and expressed concern over upholding the rights of workers. Bangladesh's economy depends heavily on the fortunes of the \$28 billion garment industry, which is struggling to improve a poor safety record epitomized by the Rana Plaza disaster of 2013 in which a factory collapse killed more than 1,100 people. Kerry was making his first visit to Bangladesh. His armored SUV hit a gate in front of the US embassy, but he was not hurt. —Reuters

BELGIAN CRIME LAB SET ON FIRE

BRUSSELS: Attackers rammed a car injured. "It's probably not terrorism. through the gates of Belgium's crime institute yesterday and set fire to a lab containing crime scene samples, apparently in an effort to destroy evidence, Brussels prosecutors said. As the blaze in the north Brussels suburb erupted, residents heard at least one explosion and Belgian media reported a bomb attack, but investigators said the noise was probably materials going up in flames.


Belgium has been on high alert since suicide bombings at the Brussels airport and subway killed 32 people on March 22, and security forces remain on standby for another attack. Prosecutors said five people were detained for questioning and released without charge following the incident, which happened at about 2 am in Neder-Over-Heembeek. No one was

It's a criminal act," said Ine Van Wymersch, a spokeswoman for the Brussels prosecutor's office. "I cannot confirm that there was any bomb." The forensic facility assists Belgium's justice authorities in carrying out their investigations and the lab contains DNA samples found at crime scenes.


"The location was not chosen randomly," Van Wymersch said. She said the lab contains "sensitive information" being used in ongoing investigations. The fire and damage hampered the efforts of investigators to enter the scene, and she said it would take some time to establish exactly what had been destroyed. "The laboratory does thousands of analyses each year, so we don't know what damage has been done yet," Van Wymersch told reporters. "It is obvious that several individuals would

have an interest in making elements in their justice file disappear."

Belgium's police and army have been deployed in large numbers since suicide bombers attacked Paris last November, leaving 130 dead. Many of the attackers had links to Belgium. Tensions have also been running high in Belgium in recent weeks amid a series of criminal knife and shooting attacks and two hoax anthrax attacks. On Friday, one person was killed and at least four were injured in an accidental explosion at a sports center near the French border. Over the weekend, Belgian Prime Minister Charles Michel announced new plans to ease the load on the security services, including creating a new force to protect key buildings and using more private security firms for concerts or sports events.—AP

IS-CLAIMED ATTACK KILLS 18 IN IRAQ OASIS TOWN

WEDDING PARTY TARGETED

KARBALA, Iraq: Attackers armed with suicide vests, rifles and grenades killed 18 people in the Iraqi oasis town of Ain al-Tamer, many of them guests at a wedding party, officials said yesterday. The attack, a rare occurrence in this region southwest of Baghdad, was claimed by the Islamic State (IS) jihadist group. iThey were carrying Kalashnikovs, hand grenades. One of them blew himself up and the others were killed by the security forces,î said the head of central Euphrates operations command, Qais Khalaf.

A local council member and a provincial health directorate source confirmed the death toll in the attack, which took place late Sunday, and said at least 26 others were wounded. Ain al-Tamer is located 50 km from the Shiite holy city of Karbala and on the edge of Anbar province, long a haven for jihadists. IS said in a statement posted on social media that its men, all of them lraqis, fought the security forces for several hours before detonating their suicide vests.

Officials said the attackers started opening fire in a neighborhood of Ain al-Tamer at around 1830 GMT on Sunday, although it was not immediately what their target was. Five members of one family were among the dead, according to a health official from Karbala province. iThe five terrorists were carrying lots of weapons and one of them blew himself up in the midst of our citizens,î said Farhan Jassem Mohammed of the local council. iSome of them were wearing civilian clothes, others military clothes. They infiltrated from the west under the cover of darkness,î he said. iOne of them may have managed to flee. There is an ongoing search,î Mohammed told AFP.

Wedding Party

The IS statement mentioned only four attackers. A former mayor of Ain al-Tamer told AFP the attackers started spraying bullets at a nearby wedding party. iThe attack kicked off as people

were attending a wedding party in the neighborhood. Several among the dead and wounded were at the party,î said Mahfouz Al-Tamimi, who is now a Karbala provincial council member.

Military commanders said the attackers came from the Anbar desert to the west, a region that is overwhelmingly Sunni and borders Saudi Arabia, Jordan and Syria. Iraqís security forces have for months been battling IS fighters in Anbar, notching up key victories in provincial Ramadi and jihadist bastion Fallujah earlier this year. IS recently lost control of an area in Anbar called Jazirat al-Khaldiyeh, a key crossroads that jihadists used to move fighters and supplies between fronts since they seized large parts of Iraq in 2014. The attack on Ain al-Tamer, in which querrilla fighters doubled up as suicide bombers, bore the hallmark of IS. The jihadists call such operations iinghamasii - which literally means iplungingî and refers to the act of penetrating deep into enemy territory. — AFP

ON SYRIA, US DEMOCRATS LOOK TO DEFLECT THE CONVERSATION

WASHINGTON: In his speech at the Republican National Convention, Donald Trump made six references to the conflict in Syria, pointing to the war-ravaged nation as a source of much of the world's turmoil, particularly immigration and extremism. A week later at the Democratic convention, Hillary Clinton made not one reference to Syria. The conflict in Syria remains a major conundrum for both President Barack Obama and Clinton, his former secretary of state.

With a firm reluctance to enter another US war in the Middle East, the United States has focused its military efforts on fighting the Islamic State group in northern Syria and in Iraq while pursuing so-far failed diplomatic efforts to end the civil war. Now entering its sixth year, the Syria conflict has killed more than a quarter million people, displaced some 11 million, and has turned the once-cosmopolitan, secular country into a hive of factions with dangerously competing interests.

Biggest legacy problems

"Of the two or three biggest legacy problems for the Obama administration, in terms of foreign policy, Syria will figure prominently on that list," said Robert Ford, US ambassador to Syria during the uprising and now a senior fellow at the Middle East Institute. There is an element within the Democratic Party, Ford adds, that "would go as far as to say the United States helped to cause that problem." Clinton has tap-danced around the issue, particularly since her views may not be in line with that of her former boss.

Her closest advisers point out that she often had a more hawkish approach to international relations than many in her party, including Obama, but delving into such a complex situation on the campaign trail risks putting off voters who are more concerned with the situation at home. "There is a benefit to the Syria debate not getting too political at this stage," said Ilan Goldenberg, a Clinton adviser who is senior fellow and director of the Middle East Security Program at the Center for a New American Security. "There will be a rigorous process of us evaluating all our options. It's much more deep than what you get on the campaign trail but my instinct is she'll lean further forward." While Clinton has been one of the most pro-intervention candidates to run for the

presidency in 2016, she has not condoned the forceful removal of Syrian President Bashar Assad from power, calling instead for a peaceful handover. In a December debate, she said she supports the establishment of a no-fly zone "to create those safe refuges within Syria."

Clinton dodges question

The aim would be "to try to protect people on the ground both from Assad's forces, who are continuing to drop barrel bombs, and from ISIS," she said, using an acronym for the Islamic State group. "And of course, it has to be de-conflicted with the Russians, who are also flying in that space," she added. But Clinton dodged a question about whether failure to take more assertive action in Syria damaged American credibility, saying at a later debate that, "as commander-in-chief, you have to be constantly evaluating the decisions you have to make." The type of intervention that many had envisioned - targeting key installments belonging to Assad's government after it was found to be using chemical weapons in 2013 - never came to fruition.

Appetite for intervention of any kind was especially low after the vastly unpopular US-led invasion of Iraq, and Washington was still reeling from the 2012 attack on the US consulate in Benghazi, Libya, that killed four Americans, including Ambassador Chris Stevens. Clinton has been forced to answer inquiries over the security failures leading to that attack. Clinton "was very sobered by the Libya experience," Ford said. "She absolutely understood, back in 2012, the need for a more muscular approach (in Syria). I never ever heard her say we need to send in the US military," he added. "But she thought there were people on the ground who we could help."

Founder of ISIS

When it came time for action in Syria, Obama opted to help moderate rebel forces and, a year later, launched airstrikes to target the Islamic State group. Obama and Secretary of State John Kerry have also supported a military partnership with Russia to limit a US expansionary role in Syria for years to come. Trump does not often address the Syria conflict, but he's repeatedly blamed the Obama administration for the rise of the

Islamic State group, which in 2014 took over a third of Syria and Iraq, though much of that territory has since been re-claimed. This month, he accused Obama of being the "founder of ISIS," adding, "I would say the co-founder would be crooked Hillary Clinton."

Trump has said that he doesn't think Assad is the biggest problem in Syria, and has called for the establishment of safe zones inside Syria for refugees so they don't have to flee the country. Outside

observers caution against expecting too much in Clinton's ability to turn this conflict around, saying that any future action is too little, too late. Joe Macaron, a policy analyst at Arab Center Washington DC, warns that "the Syrian opposition's bet on a Hillary presidency might be a rerun of weighing its options in 2011 and 2012 on the expectation of a US intervention under Obama." 106 STUDENTS DETAINED IN PAKISTAN MADRASSA RAID

QUETTA: Pakistani police raided a madrassa in the restive southwestern city of Quetta and detained 106 illegal Afghan students, officials said yesterday, as the government stepped up a campaign to rein in rogue religious schools. The detentions were made Saturday, and the students, aged between 14 to 18 years-who had no documents giving them permission to be in the country-will eventually be deported to Afghanistan, senior police official Nadeem Hussain said.

"We have sealed the madrassa as it did not have any registration documents," he said. Akbar Harifal, the Home Secretary for Balochistan province, of which Quetta is the capital, confirmed the raid and detentions. Pakistan had vowed to keep a closer eye on its 13,000 Islamic seminaries, or madrassas, as part of a "National Action Plan" after the country's deadliest extremist attack, a Taleban assault

on a school that left more than 150 people dead in December 2014. With little oversight of what was being taught to the hundreds of thousands of children enrolled in the country's madrassas, fears intensified after the 2014 attack that some religious schools were breeding grounds for intolerance or even extremism. There was no suggestion that the seminary raided Saturday had links to extremism. Pakistan is home to 1.5 million registered and about as many undocumented Afghan refugees, with growing insecurity in Afghanistan impeding voluntary return programs. Balochistan, the country's biggest and poorest province, has been plagued for more than a decade by a separatist insurgency and sectarian killings. — AFP

LIBYAN FORCES CORNER ISLAMIC STATE FIGHTERS

SIRTE: Libya's pro-government forces yesterday cornered Islamic State group jihadists in their last holdouts in the coastal city of Sirte, after heavy fighting that left dozens dead and wounded. The battle for IS's North African stronghold was launched more than three months ago by forces loyal to the Tripoli-based Government of National Accord (GNA).

Loyalist forces have been backed by US air raids for almost a month, amid international concern over the jihadists' growing influence. IS overran the Mediterranean hometown of Libya's slain dictator Moamer Kadhafi in mid-2015, sparking fears the jihadists would use it as a springboard for attacks on Europe. Pro-GNA forces yesterday said they had encircled the jihadists in less than two square kilometers of Sirte, after staging an assault the previous day on its last two IS-held districts.

The anti-IS fighters "seized a little more than half of district Number Three and 70 percent of district Number One" in the downtown seafront area, they said. At least 38 pro-GNA fighters have been killed and 185 wounded since they began the "final battle" to retake all of Sirte on Sunday, the hospital for the loyalist forces in the nearby city of Misrata said. The pro-GNA field hospital in Sirte on Sunday called for blood donations. IS casualty figures have been unavailable. The jihadists deployed at least 12 suicide car bombs in a last bid to slow the loyalist advance, pro-GNA forces said.

Mosque retaken

After sporadic clashes during the night, the front was calm yesterday morning, according to an AFP photographer in the city 450 kilometers east of Tripoli. "Our forces are preparing to launch a new assault on the area where Daesh is encircled," said a spokesman for the pro-GNA campaign, Reda Issa, using an Arabic acronym for IS. In district Number Three, loyalists have retaken the Qortoba Mosque, which the jihadists had renamed after slain Al-Qaeda leader Abu Musab al-Zarqawi, the campaign's media office said. IS set fire to

the mosque's library after entering the city, killing an imam and using its courtyard for "torture and executions", it said.

In June 2015, IS fighters seized Sirte, hoisting their black flag above the city. Pro-GNA forces fought their way into Sirte a year later, this June 9, but their advance has been hampered by snipers, suicide bombings and booby traps. More than 400 loyalist fighters have been killed and nearly 2,500 wounded in the battle for Sirte since May, medical sources say. The pro-GNA forces are mostly militias from western cities backing the unity government of premier-designate Fayez Al-Sarraj and the guards of oil installations that IS has repeatedly tried to seize. Backed by US air strikes since August 1, they managed to seize the jihadists' headquarters at the Ouagadougou conference centre on August 10, pinning down IS fighters near

1,000 IS fighters

As of August 24, US warplanes had carried out 82 strikes, according to the US Africa Command. Since Tuesday, the United States has also begun using more precise AH-1W SuperCobra attack helicopters in the operation. The United States also leads a coalition fighting IS in Syria and Iraq, where the jihadists seized large swathes of territory in 2014.

Analysts say ousting IS from Libya would be a symbolic boost for the country's fragile unity government, but unrest might continue as IS could carry out more scattered attacks across Libya. Before it was seized by IS, Sirte was home to some 120,000 residents, but a pro-GNA military leader said this month that all had fled except for the families of the jihadists. Pentagon spokesman Gordon Trowbridge this month estimated that jihadist fighters in Sirte numbered fewer than 1,000.

IS took advantage of the chaos in Libya after the 2011 uprising that toppled and killed Kadhafi, as rival militias and authorities have vied for control of the oil-rich country. — AFP

THAILAND POLICE LINK BEACH-TOWN BOMBINGS TO MUSLIM INSURGENCY

BANGKOK: Thai police identified yesterday a third suspect wanted in connection with a wave of bombs in tourist towns this month that killed four people and for the first time linked the attacks to Muslim separatists operating in the far south. Thailand's tourist industry had been largely spared a spill-over of violence from a decades-old insurgency in the far south and authorities had at first dismissed any connection between the Aug 11-12 bombings and the separatists.

But police issuing an arrest warrant for a third suspect yesterday said all three of the people they wanted to question had links to previous attacks blamed on the Muslim insurgents. "The three suspects for which we have obtained an arrest warrants are known to have ties to other previous attacks in the southern provinces," deputy national police spokesman Kissana Phathanacharoen said.

Police identified the third suspect as Asamin Katemadi and said he was also wanted in connection with a 2015 bomb attack on the tourist island of Samui. Four Thai people were killed in the coordinated bomb attacks in various tourist town south of Bangkok this month and dozens were wounded, including foreigners. The military government, apparently loath to spread

alarm in the tourist industry, the one bright spot in a generally flat economy, at first dismissed any suggestion the Muslim separatists battling the predominantly Buddhist country's government might be to blame.

Authorities even hinted that supporters of ousted populist premier Thaksin Shinawatra might have been responsible. He denied any link. Thailand's three farsouth provinces of Pattani, Yala and Narathiwat are majority-Muslim and resistance to central government rule has existed there for decades, resurfacing violently in 2004. More than 6,500 people have been killed in the largely ethnic Malay region since then in bombings and shootings that take place almost daily, according to Deep South Watch, a group which monitors the conflict. Peace talks between the government and shadowy insurgents group began in 2013 under the civilian government of Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra, Thaksin's sister, but have stalled since the military overthrew her in 2014. Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha said on Monday meetings were taking place between the government and various insurgent groups in Malaysia but he insisted that there needed to be a cessation of violence before further terms were discussed. — Reuters

TUNISIA'S NEW UNITY GOVERNMENT TAKES OFFICE

TUNIS: The new Tunisian unity government took office in the birthplace of the Arab Spring yesterday, with Prime Minister Youssef Chahed, the country's youngest-ever leader, facing major economic and security challenges. At 40, Chahed is Tunisia's youngest premier since independence from France in 1956, and the seventh in less than six years since the 2011 uprising that ousted strongman Zine El Abidine Ben Ali. His new cabinet of 26 ministers and 14 ministers of state includes women, "young" and independent ministers, three members of the Islamist Ennahda party and two former members of the powerful UGTT union.

It formally took office on Monday at a ceremony in Carthage just outside Tunis during which outgoing premier Habib Essid, 67, handed over power. "I hope this government will last," Essid said. "The worst thing for this country is the government changing ever year or year and a half." Chahed said: "The situation is complicated, but we're optimistic. We will shoulder our responsibilities." "Don't worry about Tunisia and its future," he told his predecessor.

While Tunisia is considered to be a rare success story of the Arab Spring, the authorities have failed to resolve the issues of poverty, unemployment and corruption that preceded Ben Ali's fall. A wave of jihadist attacks, including two deadly assaults last vear that killed dozens of foreign tourists, has further

exacerbated problems in the economy, which relies heavily on tourism revenues. Analysts say it is too soon to tell if Chahed can restore security and revitalize Tunisia's battered economy which grew by just 0.8 percent last year compared with 2.3 percent in 2014.

"It is difficult to say if this last-minute government will have the time to prove it is efficient," said political analyst Slaheddin Jourchi. "Current indicators give the impression that failure may be closer than success," he said. The new government won a vote of confidence in parliament on Friday, with 167 out of 217 lawmakers in favor of the line-up. In a rousing speech to parliament, Chahed spoke of the dire state of the economy and said that "we are all responsible" and "we will all have to make sacrifices". "If nothing changes by 2017 austerity will follow," he warned. He also said his government would give priority to fighting corruption and "terrorism".

Chahed was appointed by President Beji Caid Essebsi early this month after lawmakers passed a vote of no confidence in Essid's government following just 18 months in office. Essid had already been forced into making a sweeping government reshuffle in January, when the country witnessed some of its worst social unrest since the 2011 uprising. AUSTRALIA'S TURNBULL FACES A TOUGH PARLIAMENT AFTER ELECTION SETBACK

CANBERRA: Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull faces a tooth and nail fight with an emboldened opposition and slew of independent lawmakers when parliament returns today for the first time since elections last month in which he took a beating. Turnbull called early polls to break a deadlock in the upper house Senate, where a handful of independents blocked the government's agenda of corporate tax cuts and workplace reforms for more than two years.

But the election backfired, leaving the ruling Liberal-National coalition with a onevote majority in the lower house and dependant on either the opposition Labor Party or eight to 10 independents or minor party Senators to pass legislation. "The government no longer has a working majority. Everything that happens in Parliament now will be affected by the weak support the prime minister has in his own party room," Labor's Manager of Opposition Business Tony Burke told Reuters.

SPAIN STARTS COUNTDOWN TO A 3RD NATIONAL ELECTION IN A YEAR

MADRID: The clock starts ticking tomorrow towards what could be Spain's third national election in a year when acting Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy faces a confidence vote in parliament for a second term in office. Spain has been without a functioning government since inconclusive elections in December and June failed to hand a convincing mandate to any political party. So far, party leaders have been unable to agree on forming a coalition.

The eight-month political deadlock has delayed investments in infrastructure such as roads and rail and put high-ranking government appointments on hold, leaving some Spanish embassies without an ambassador.

Rajov's centre-right People's Party (PP) won the most votes in June's election but lacks the majority it needs to win the vote even with support from centrists Ciudadanos (Citizens), Spain's fourth-biggest party. The opposition Socialists have refused to back Rajoy or smooth the way to a PP-led

EGYPT SEEKS TOUGHER PUNISHMENT FOR FEMALE GENITAL MUTILATION

CAIRO: Women's rights activists hailed the Egyptian government yesterday for advocating increased prison sentences for perpetrators of female genital mutilation (FGM) but warned that a new law could shroud the practice in greater secrecy. Egypt's cabinet on Sunday approved a bill, which must be passed by parliament to become law, imposing jail terms of up to seven years for people who perform FGM and up to three years for those who escort a girl or woman to undergo the practice.

It is currently punishable in Egypt by between three months and two years in prison under a 2008 law, which was enacted after an 11-year-old girl died following an FGM procedure. The drive for tougher sentences follows the recent death of a 17-yearold girl of complications during an FGM operation in a private hospital in Suez province.

The Egyptian Initiative for Personal Rights (EIPR), a Cairo-based rights group, welcomed the bill but said it may not deter people from performing FGM and could drive it further underground. "It will also decrease the rate of reporting FGM cases, as imposing a punishment on whoever escorts a girl to have the operation will make families fear reporting cases," Dalia Abd El-Hameed of the EIPR told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. FGM affects an estimated 140 million girls and women across a swathe of Africa and parts of the Middle East and Asia and is seen as a gateway to marriage and a way of preserving a girl's purity. It causes numerous health problems that can be fatal. More than nine in 10 women and girls aged 15 to 49 have undergone FGM in Egypt, and some 80 percent of the procedures are carried out by medical professionals, according to the United Nations. Yet the proportion of girls aged 15 to 17 in Egypt who have been cut dropped to about six in 10 as of 2014, down from three quarters in 2008, the UN Population Fund (UNFPA) said. "We have seen some reduction in FGM in Egypt, but at the same time health professionals and others are still not being held to account for carrying it out," said Suad Abu-Dayyeh of the London-based human rights group

In January 2015, Dr Raslan Fadl was convicted of manslaughter in Egypt's first FGM trial after a 13-year-old girl died in a botched procedure. While Fadl was sentenced to more than two years in prison, he has not yet served his jail term. Rights groups say the current law has not been enforced and that society is permissive of FGM, which is widely practiced among Muslims as well as Christians in the mostly Muslim nation. "Many people still link the idea of honor with female circumcision, so it is not about stiffening the law as much as addressing people's mindsets," said Reda Al-Danbouki of the Egyptian group Women's Centre for Guidance and Legal Awareness. — Reuters

BRASILIA: Suspended president Dilma Rousseff arrived yesterday at Brazil's Senate for a dramatic finale to an impeachment trial likely ending 13 vears of leftist rule in Latin America's biggest country. Rousseff, 68, was greeted by cheering supporters as she arrived in the Senate to testify for the first time in her defense, just hours before senators were to start voting on her fate. "Dilma, warrior of the Brazilian homeland!" the crowd of supporters shouted.

Rousseff is accused of having taken illegal state loans to patch budget holes. Momentum to push her out is also fueled by deep anger at Brazil's historic recession, political paralysis and a vast corruption scandal centered on state oil giant Petrobras. The first female president of Brazil, who says she did nothing worthy of impeachment, was to speak for about half an hour from the podium, then face questioning from allies and opponents. It was unclear whether Rousseff would repeat her explosive claim on the Senate floor that the trial is a coup d'etat aimed at destroying her Workers' Party and restoring the right to power. However, the packed Senate chamber crackled with tension.

Showdown

Rousseff came to the showdown accompanied by heavyweight allies, including her presidential predecessor Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, and a dozen former cabinet members. A small crowd of loyalists gathered from early morning outside the Senate and supporters shouted "Dilma come back!" from cars as they drove past the building's entrance. However, there appeared to be little Rousseff could say to save her presidency.

Closing arguments will begin after her testimony, followed by voting, possibly extending till tomorrow. Opponents say they will easily reach the needed two-thirds majority - 54 of 81 senators-to remove her from office. In that case, Rousseff's former vice president turned political enemy, Michel Temer, will be confirmed as president until elections in 2018. Temer, from the center-right PMDB party, has already been acting president since May, using his brief period in power to steer the government rightward. He plans to leave today or tomorrow on his first official foreign trip, a G20 summit in China, where officials say he will push to restore the tattered reputation of Brazil's economy.

Tortured under dictatorship

Criticized for lacking a popular touch or appetite for backroom politicking, Rousseff has barely double digit approval ratings. However, supporters outside the Senate said they backed Rousseff's claim to be victim of trumped up charges in a rightwing coup. "I am fighting to defend democracy and the dignity of the people. This has been a persecution against the Workers' Party, Dilma and the Brazilian people," said one of about 100 protesters outside the Senate, retired teacher Marlene Bastos, 65.

Although most Brazilians have abandoned Rousseff, there is lingering sympathy for a woman who was imprisoned and tortured by the military dictatorship in the 1970s for belonging to a far left urban guerrilla cell. Although her

presidency has been mired in the Petrobras embezzlement and bribery scandal, Rousseff herself has never been charged with trying to enrich herself-unlike many of her prominent accusers and close allies. Temer is hardly more popular, according to opinion polls. He faces harsh questioning over his legitimacy as an unelected president and was loudly booed at the recent Olympic opening ceremony in Rio de

Criminal or scapegoat?

The impeachment case rests on narrow charges that Rousseff took unauthorized state loans to bridge budget shortfalls during her 2014 election to a second term. Allies have spent the Senate trial arguing that these loans were nothing more than stopgap measures frequently employed by previous governments. Opponents, however, have broadened the accusation to paint Rousseff's loans as part of her disastrous mismanagement, contributing to once booming Brazil's slide into recession. Brazil's economy shrank 3.8 percent in 2015 and is forecast to drop a further 3.3 percent this year, the worst performance since the 1930s. Inflation stands at around nine percent and unemployment at 11 percent. Rousseff's side says that decline was caused by forces far beyond the president's control, notably a worldwide slump in commodity prices, which hit exports hard. — AFP

BEIRUT EDITOR FINED €20,000 FOR HARIRI COURT CONTEMPT

LEIDSCHENDAM, Netherlands: A special court yesterday fined the editor of a Beirutbased newspaper 20,000 euros (\$22,000) for publishing secret information about witnesses in the case against the alleged killers of former Lebanese premier Rafiq Hariri. Ibrahim Al-Amin, the editor-in-chief of the Al-Akhbar newspaper, was found guilty in July of contempt of court by the UN-backed Special Tribunal for Lebanon.

The prosecutor on Monday urged the court, based in the leafy town of Leidschendam just outside The Hague, to impose a two-year jail term on Amin and a \$75,000 fine. Amin and the pro-Hezbollah Al-Akhbar newspaper were convicted of contempt after running two articles in January 2013 with the names and photographs of 32 witnesses in its Arabic print and online editions. The articles were entitled "STL Leaks: The Prosecution's Surprise Witnesses" and "The STL Witness List: Why We Published". Hariri and 22 others, including a suspected suicide bomber, died in a massive car bomb blast on the Beirut waterfront on February 14, 2005.

"I sentence M. Ibrahim Mohammed Ali Al-Amin to a fine of 20,000 euros, to be paid in full by 30 September, 2016," said judge Nicola Lettieri. He also imposed "a fine of 6,000 thousand euros to be paid in full by 30 September, 2016" on the paper.

The prosecutor Kenneth Scott had also called for a fine of 112,700 euros to be imposed on the paper. But defense counsel Antonios Abu Kasm argued that such a fine would end up "penalizing the employees and their families, who will suffer direct financial consequences, given the already delicate financial situation" of the paper.

Five suspected members of the powerful Shiite movement Hezbollah were originally indicted by the court, set up in 2009, and their trial in absentia opened in January 2014. However, the court has quashed the case against one of the accused, Hezbollah commander Mustafa Badreddine, who is believed to have died in fighting in Syria in May.

Earlier this year the STL acquitted on appeal a senior Lebanese television journalist in a similar case involving the alleged publication of witness names in the highly-sensitive trial. Hezbollah's leader Hassan Nasrallah has dismissed the tribunal as a US-Israeli plot, and vowed none of the defendants will ever be caught. — AFP

OPTIONS SOUGHT AS MERKEL'S RADIO SILENCE COMPLICATES PATH TO SOFT BREXIT LANDING

MERKEL WANTS BREXIT CLARITY, REFUSES TO PRE-NEGOTIATE

BERLIN: Triggering the procedure for Britain to exit the European Union is like turning off the engines on an airplane, a top European diplomat says: best only do it if you can see a landing strip. Otherwise, all parties risk a messy outcome. When Britain makes its exit move - by invoking Article 50 of the EU's Lisbon Treaty - it will set the clock running on a two-year deadline to leave the EU. Keen to avoid a crash landing, officials on both sides are scoping out how to proceed.

Options include the 'neverland' possibility of simply not invoking Article 50, trying back channel talks to sharpen Britain's sense of what scenarios are possible, and hopping from an interim outcome to a more permanent post-Brexit landing site. The first option is a non-starter for German Chancellor Angela Merkel, Europe's most powerful leader and the first one Theresa May met after becoming British prime minister last month. "The EU can't accept that," said a source close to Merkel, who has no desire to see Britain leave but has a pragmatic focus on holding the rest of bloc together, and does not believe Britain will hold a second referendum on its EU membership.

Even if the British economy's resilience in the immediate aftermath of the country's June 23 vote to leave the EU eases the economic pressure on Britain to press ahead with Brexit, May herself has said "Brexit means Brexit". She has, however, said Britain will not trigger the exit procedure this year. For the British government, the dilemma of when and how to make a Brexit landing is complicated by a refusal on the part of EU leaders, led by Merkel, to discuss potential outcomes until Britain invokes the exit procedure.

"We won't talk beforehand," said the source close to Merkel, speaking on condition of anonymity. Another German government official stressed the strict ban in


Berlin on any pre-negotiating: "We won't talk about substance." In the absence of formal pre-negotiations, the British government must work through the second option: peering through gaps in the clouds of European officialdom to try to work out what it's post-Brexit 'landing' options are. Such back channeling could help the British work out what is realistic in order to avoid EU negotiators balking at their position, and the clock running down on the two-year deadline. "You can only nail it down if you are in the realm of the possible," said one European official.

'Special status' A likely trade-off between EU market access (which Britain would prefer) and the free movement of people (which is does not want) will probably leave a few achievable 'landing points', leaving British officials to try to identify these in informal meetings with cagey counterparts. Here, they may yet find a way forward. There have been indications from at least one government that there may be room for discussions, rather than negotiations, in advance of Britain triggering Article 50. German officials have also signaled they are ready to make some concessions to strike a deal with Britain. European Affairs Minister Michael Roth has held out the possibility of London achieving "special status" in its ties with the EU after Brexit.

But European leaders do not want Britain to hold the bloc hostage by horse trading on the terms of an exit before it commits to leave. So even if British officials sharpen their sense of the kind of deal they can strike, they still face a tight timeframe to clinch a post-Brexit settlement with the EU. Behind the scenes, there has been a growing realization in Europe's capitals that the two-year window for negotiating Brexit is far too short.

framework for Britain's ties with the EU, based on an existing model similar to that of Norway or Switzerland. "That might be a temporary solution," said one. Further talks could then result in another landing spot beyond the two-year negotiating window offered by Article 50. A spokeswoman for May said the prime minister and her government were going for a "British deal", to get the best for the country. The trickiest area is the crunch trade-off between market access and the free movement of people, which is sacrosanct to EU leaders. "The price on free movement for prosperity is high," the European official said.

One option to reduce the flow of people to Britain is for it to firm up rules around benefits such that only people from other EU countries with a firm job offer can move to the UK. Merkel has cut May some breathing space to work out her negotiating position, resisting calls from Paris and Brussels - in the days immediately after the Brexit vote - for Britain to leave the EU "as soon as possible". "There was a lot of testosterone flying around in the days after the referendum. That's when Merkel is at her best," said one British official. "She pulled it all back and said 'it's okay to take your time." But there is a limit to Merkel's patience. The source close to her said: "It's in everyone's interests to have clarity. —Reuters

KASSERINE: Three Tunisian soldiers were killed in a "terrorist attack" yesterday near Mount Sammama, a hideout for jihadists at war with the authorities, security sources said. They said the attack also left six others wounded, but without giving details. The soldiers were killed in an explosion, according to Wataniya television. Mosaique FM radio reported clashes between the army and "terrorist elements" and said the three were killed when a blast hit their vehicle as they combed an area near the town of Kasserine. The defense ministry was unavailable for immediate comment about the deaths, which came as a new unity government took office in Tunisia with security among its top priorities. Jihadist attacks in Tunisia have cost dozens of lives among security forces as well as civilians, and 59 foreign tourists were also killed in 2015. Tunisian forces have been tracking jihadists mainly in the mountainous regions of Chaambi and Sammama, southwest of the capital Tunis.

US drone enters Iran's airspace; Tehran warns

ANKARA: Iran's military detected a US drone entering Iranian airspace yesterday and issued a warning for it to leave, which it subsequently did, Iran's Tasnim news agency reported. "Iran's army air defense detected and warned an American drone in the eastern airspace of the country. It was coming from Afghanistan. The drone left the area," Tasnim quoted the Iranian military as saying. Tasnim gave no details on how the Iranian authorities had warned the unmanned drone to leave its airspace. A US defense official said last week that four of Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) vessels "harassed" a US warship on Tuesday near the Strait of Hormuz. Tehran said the ships had only been carrying out their regular duties monitoring foreign ships near Iranian waters.

Church attacker 'obsessed'

JAKARTA: A knife-wielding Indonesian teen who tried

with Islamic State leader

to attack a priest at a church during a Sunday service was "obsessed" with extremist group Islamic State, a senior minister said yesterday. Indonesian authorities are increasingly worried about a resurgence in radicalism in the world's largest Muslim-majority country, driven in part by a new generation of jihadis inspired by Islamic State (IS). "From the cellphone that was seized by security forces, this youth was obsessed with Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi," Chief Security Minister Wiranto told reporters, referring to the leader of the Middle Eastern militant group. Wiranto, who goes by one name, said a note was found in the attacker's backpack that said "I love Al-Baghdadi" but added the suspect had no known links to existing militant networks. There were no serious casualties in the latest attempted attack, which happened in a church in Medan, northern Sumatra. Police said the attacker had attempted to stab the priest, who suffered minor injuries, and detonate a crude home-made bomb but failed after being restrained by other worshippers.

Reports of gunfire at airport 'false alarm'

LOS ANGELES: Terminals at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) were evacuated briefly late on Sunday after reports of gunfire that police later determined were incorrect, in the second recent false alarm at a major US airport. At least two terminals were closed while security personnel checked them for anything suspicious, according to Officer Alicia Hernandez of the Los Angeles Police Department. The central terminal's arrival and departures areas as well as all other terminals re-opened after about two hours. An investigation was under way, Andy Neiman, head of media relations for the LAPD, said in a Twitter message. The alert came two months after police temporarily evacuated a terminal at New York City's John F Kennedy International Airport while they investigated reports of gunfire there, also later determined to be false. A preliminary investigation of that incident, which also occurred on a Sunday evening, found no evidence of foul play or suspicious activity. US airport security officials have been on heightened alert in recent months following deadly attacks at international airports in Belgium and Turkey.

ITALY 'VULNERABLE BEAUTY' LACKS FUNDS AND ATTENTION AGAINST EARTHQUAKES

the medieval town of Norcia swayed but held up last week when a 6.2 magnitude earthquake rocked mountainous central Italy. Just 24 km away in Amatrice, which used to bill itself as the town of 100 churches, the historic centre was flattened and not a single holy place escaped undamaged. The fact that a town in the main quake zone was largely unscathed while others have been crushed might have a lot to do with the vagaries of seismic shocks, which can bring disproportionate damage depending on land formation. But it might also be because picture-postcard Norcia has consistently invested in anti-seismic protection for its ancient buildings, while its less famous neighbors have not. Norcia represents the exception, not the rule in Italy, where the majority of buildings were constructed more than a century ago, well before antiseismic norms were introduced. The question is whether the heavily indebted country has the will and the money to safeguard all its homes and cultural treasures.

Italy is home to more UNESCO world heritage sites than any other nation, with architectural and artistic masterpieces ranging from Greek and Roman remains to the frescoes of the late Mediaeval painter Giotto and residences or "palazzi" of the Renaissance and Baroque periods. But it is also an active seismic zone, experiencing 36 earthquakes with a magnitude of 5 and above since 1900. Almost every one has brought death and destruction, with nearly 300 people dying in the latest disaster.

Such tragedies inevitably trigger rounds of recriminations about why successive governments haven't done more to defend Italians' lives and heritage. "We should get to the churches, monuments and palazzi before the quakes do, but we always end up chasing them," says Paolo Clemente from Italy's multidisciplinary research centre ENEA. "If everything is left as it is, our cultural heritage is destined to die...".

Prime Minister Matteo Renzi, like other leaders before him, has promised a renewed push to bolster the flimsy earthquake defenses and met the celebrated Italian architect Renzo Piano on Sunday to help devise a national prevention plan. But like many Italians, Renzi has a fatalistic streak. "It's illusory to think you can control everything," he said last Thursday. "It's hard to imagine that (this disaster) could have been avoided simply using different

Red tape

Many experts disagree, saying Italy's towns and cities can be protected so long as you have a very deep pocket. "It is possible to reconcile (artistic) beauty with security when you have money," said Caterina Bon Valsassina, Italy's director general of cultural heritage, arts and landscape. "Once we were rich, but we aren't anymore." Some 40 billion euros (\$45 billion) would be needed to secure Italy's public buildings, according to the National Engineers' Association. The bill would go up to 360 billion euros to upgrade all the building stock, the country's employers association Confindustria estimates.

Italy has the largest debt mountain in the European Union as a proportion of its output after Greece, and its economy has barely grown in the last 17 years. This means there is very little money for major new budget items, such as nationwide earthquake-proofing. Government adviser Mauro Grassi says Italy should spend 4 billion euros a year for the next 20 years on disaster prevention programmes, arguing that this is roughly what the country is spending now on disaster response and reconstruction.

But even if it did, there is no guarantee it would be spent wisely, with corruption, bureaucracy, shoddy workmanship and organized crime all lurking in the shadows. Amatrice's main school was reopened in 2012 after the local authorities spent 700,000 euros on a refurbishment, including anti-seismic protection. It now lies in ruins. "If these buildings had been constructed like they are in Japan, then they would not have collapsed," prosecutor Giuseppe Saieva, who is leading an inquiry into why so many buildings collapsed last week, told la Repubblica newspaper. The reconstruction effort in L'Aquila, a 13th century city walloped by an earthquake in 2009, is still many years from completion. Seven building contractors were arrested in 2014 on allegations they were working with the Mafia. Other delays have been caused by often bewildering red tape that would surely snarl any significant campaign to retrofit buildings with anti-seismic protection. A recently introduced code for assigning public work contracts includes 220 norms. It is designed to root out graft but local authorities say it is a tangled nightmare to follow. — Reuters

PARIS: The campaign to choose a centreright candidate for the French presidential election has already descended into clashes between former president Nicolas Sarkozy and his main rival Alain Juppe over bans on the burkini swimsuit. The opening barbs between the two leading candidates for November's first-ever centre-right primary came after several French mayors said they would defy a ruling by France's highest Administrative Court which on Friday suspended a ban on the burkini.

The always-outspoken Sarkozy, who was president from 2007 to 2012, has plunged into the row since entering the race last week, saying France has to fight to protect its secular "way of life". "We don't want any external signs of belonging to a religion in our country," he said on Saturday. "I won't be the candidate of fudged compromises, of denying the reality and of half-baked solutions on immigration like the rest of them," 61-year-old Sarkozy told a crowd of young supporters. Juppe, a former prime minister who opinion polls show is France's most popular politician, set the tone for his campaign by telling supporters this weekend he wanted to "bring people together rather than fuelling the fire".

'Respect diversity'

While some observers have complained about the lack of fresh faces in the campaign, 71-year-Juppe is trying to use his age and his moderate stance to his advantage. He argues that at a time when France is under the constant threat of terror attack and its image is under fire abroad over burkini bans imposed by a string of southeastern towns, the country needs someone of his wide experience. "France is diverse and that's a fact," he said. "We don't all have the same origins or the same skin color or religion and that should be

In stark contrast to Sarkozy, Juppe condemned the febrile atmosphere surrounding the issue of the burkini bans which were introduced by around 30 towns in the wake of two more Islamist attacks in France this summer. "Where is this mania which has gripped French society going to end? Are we going to ban long shirts in

schools next?" he asked in a Europe 1 radio interview. Juppe has also poured cold water on the idea of a ban on wearing the Islamic headscarf in universities, a measure that Sarkozy would like to see introduced to bolster France's strict secular code.

'French Guantanamo'

But he reserved his strongest criticism for another key Sarkozy demand, to create internment camps for suspects believed to have been radicalized to prevent them from carrying out attacks. Juppe said he did want to see "a French-style Guantanamo in which thousands of people would be imprisoned without trial". The centre-right primary, due to take place over two rounds on November 20 and 27, appears increasingly crucial because of the deep unpopularity of Socialist President Francois Hollande.

Hollande, who has been dragged down by a moribund economy and has recorded some of the lowest popularity scores of any post-war French president, has said he will decide by the end of the year whether to stand for re-election. Whoever wins the centre-right primary would be in a strong position to win the presidential race next May, most likely in a second-round headto-head with Marine Le Pen, leader of the far-right National Front (FN). It is on the issue of immigration and the place of Islam in France that the stances of the centreright's candidates truly diverge because their approaches to the economy are

While opinion polls continue to show Juppe will win the primary, at least one poll published on Sunday showed Sarkozy has closed the gap considerably in the space of a week. The TNS Sofres poll showed both candidates would score around 34 percent in the first round. A total of 13 candidates will line up in November's contest, but only two Sarkozy's former Prime Minister François Fillon and one of his former ministers, Bruno Le Maire-appear capable of denting the support for either the former president or Juppe. Anyone on the electoral register can vote in the primary if they pay two euros (\$2.2) and pledge to adhere to the "values of the right and centre". — AFP

OBAMA HEADS TO LAOS - SIGNS OF A TILT AWAY FROM CHINA

FIRST US SITTING PRESIDENT TO VISIT LAOS

VIENTIANE: The secretive communist government of Laos, a country with a population of less than 7 million, rarely causes a ripple on the diplomatic circuit. And yet its sleepy capital will spring to life next week when global leaders arrive for an Asian summit. Barack Obama will be among them, making the last push of his presidency to 'rebalance' Washington's foreign policy towards Asia, a strategy widely seen as a response to China's economic and military muscle-flexing across the region. The might of Laos' giant neighbor to the north is hard to miss in Vientiane: wealthy Chinese driving SUVs overtake tuk-tuks sputtering along the roads and Chinese-backed hotels sprout from noisy construction sites in one of Asia's most low-rise cities.

But diplomats say Obama could be pushing on an open door in Laos, thanks to a change of government there in April. They say the country's new leaders appear ready to tilt away from Beijing and lean

more closely towards another neighbor, Vietnam, whose dispute with China over the South China Sea has pushed it into a deepening alliance with the United States. "The new government is more influenced by the Vietnamese than the Chinese," said a Western diplomat in Southeast Asia." "It's never too late for a US president to visit."

Obama will become the first sitting US president to visit landlocked Laos, where the United States waged a "secret war" while fighting in Vietnam, dropping an estimated two million tons of bombs on the country. About 30 percent of the ordnance failed to explode, leaving a dangerous and costly legacy. Laos has strategic importance to both Vietnam and China. Vietnam has a long land border with Laos that gives it access to markets in Thailand and beyond. For China, Laos is a key gateway to Southeast Asia in its "new Silk Road" trade strategy. Laos, which is developing a series of hydropower plants along

one of the world's longest rivers, the Mekong, aims to become "the battery of Asia" by selling power to its neighbors.

Shifting policy

It is difficult to read policy in Laos because its leaders are so uncommunicative, but Western diplomats have detected some shifts. First, deputy Prime Minister Somsavat Lengsavad - who ran the steering panel for a \$7 billion Chinese rail project - retired. The project is now believed to be on hold because Laos is unhappy with the terms of the deal. Officials of Prime Minister Thongloun Sisoulith's new government, many of them educated in Vietnam, have visited Hanoi en masse in recent weeks, their first foreign trip. At two of the past meetings of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), which is currently chaired by Laos, Vientiane has taken a more nuanced stance on Beijing than neighboring Cambodia, which is increasingly seen as a Chinese satellite.

"The US strategic interest in Laos is to see the country be able to exert a certain degree of strategic autonomy because you don't want ... (to) have something akin to the relationship between China and Cambodia," said Phuong Nguyen of the Washington-based Center for Strategic and International Studies think-tank. A defense official in Washington did not comment on wider strategic issues but described Laos as "an important partner." A China foreign ministry spokesman said we welcome any country, including those inside and outside this region, developing constructive relations, as long as these ties are really beneficial to regional peace, stability and prosperity."

Long-term battle

Beijing has invested around \$1 billion annually in Laos in 2014 and 2015, a step up from the \$4.5 billion invested histori-

cally before 2014, according to figures from China's Ministry of Commerce and state-run media. For the United States, impoverished Laos is not a strong investment draw. "In Laos, we bring 7-8 companies to the table compared with 30-40 companies that Vietnam brings. But China- that's a totally different ball game," said Anthony Nelson, director of the US-ASEAN business council.

"So there's no coincidence that the countries with the lowest levels of development, Laos and Cambodia, are the most willing to advocate for China's position in international discussions." But the Lao are closer culturally to Vietnam than they are to China. Their businesses use Lao language signs and mixed Lao-Vietnamese families incorporate local customs, while Lao-Chinese families tend to be isolated. "We are a bit frustrated with (China). They create their own eco-system," a Lao businessman said. — Reuters

MAHARASHTRA TO GIVE WOMEN SLUM DWELLERS JOINT OWNERSHIP RIGHTS

MUMBAI: The Indian state of Maharashtra will give women slum dwellers equal ownership rights with men, the first such move by the state where millions live in the very poor neighborhoods. About 55 slums in the city of Nagpur will be regularized under a plan to recognize the more than 25,000 families who live there as legal residents. Each family will be given a land title that gives joint ownership to the man and woman, a senior official said. "We have given land titles in the past to slum dwellers, but this time the titles will have the name of the woman as well," said Shrawan Hardikar, com-

missioner at the Nagpur municipal corporation. "We wish to empower women with equal rights to property as men. Especially for the poorest of the poor who live in slums, land and property are a means of security," he told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. Hundreds of millions of people live in slums in Indian cities because they cannot afford to buy or rent a home. They are often migrant workers who move in search of better economic opportunities. Many live in shacks with no running water or toilets, under the constant threat of eviction or displacement.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra

Fadnavis last week said Nagpur's lead may be applied to slums across the state.

While Indian law gives women equal ownership rights to land and property, women are seldom aware of their rights and are often denied access, said Shivani Chaudhry, executive director of advocacy group Housing and Land Rights Network in India. "We welcome this move to give joint ownership titles, but while these rights exist on paper, in reality women aren't allowed to access these rights," said Chaudhry.

"These steps need to be accompanied by ways to increase women's awareness of their rights and some measure of protection of these rights. Implementation also needs to be monitored to ensure women are really able to access these rights," she said. India ranked 59 of 128 countries in the International Property Rights Index 2016. The index measures factors including the legal and political environment, physical property rights and intellectual property rights. India fared particularly badly in areas such as gender equality that measured women's access to land and to bank loans for property, as well as inheritance rights for widows and daughters. — Reuters

SURVIVORS OF NEPAL'S INSURGENCY FEAR CRIMES WILL GO UNPUNISHED

KATHMANDU: The image of the teacher's body tied to a tree and riddled with bullets still haunts his son 14 years later. Communist militants allegedly dragged the Nepalese man from the class he was teaching and then killed him for refusing to give part of his salary to fund their bloody rebellion. Suman Adhikari has little hope he will get justice for his father's death - not with the same Maoist fighters-turned-politicians controlling the

Himalayan country's government.

Despite international pressure and government promises, including by the Communist Party of Nepal (Maoist Center) themselves, Adhikari and thousands of other conflict victims are still waiting for information about loved ones who were among the 17,000 killed or hundreds who disappeared during the decade-long insurgency demanding an end to the country's now-defunct monarchy. "The Maoists want everyone to forgive and forget whatever happened during the conflict, but that is not acceptable to us," said 40-year-old Adhikari, who works for a Kathmandu-based

charity that works with the deaf.
Earlier this month, Maoist leader Pushpa Kamal Dahal became Nepal's prime minister, leading the poor and politically fractious country's ninth coalition government in 10 years. His ascent to the top elected position completed the Maoist's political rehabilitation started in 2006 when they signed a UN-brokered peace accord to end their guerrilla campaign against authorities. Meanwhile, Nepal is still beset by ethnic conflict and protests against its new constitution, and coping from widespread damage caused by earthquakes that killed thousands last year.

Truth and Reconciliation

For victims of the old insurgency, the Maoists' rise was nothing to celebrate. Those hoping for resolution from a newly assembled Truth and Reconciliation Committee fear the Maoists will seek to sweep away post-conflict cases by delaying investigations, ignoring advice to prosecute or even legislating for a general amnesty that would absolve all crimes. With the committee's mandate expiring in February next year, some of its 100 staff mem-

Communist militants allegedly dragged the Nepalese man from the class he was teaching and then killed bers admit they have neither the time nor the manpower to investigate the more than 53,000 complaints alleging human rights violations unless the government extends its mission. None of the cases have been resolved so far.

"In the time we have left, I don't think we will be able to deal with even a fraction of the number of cases we have in our hands," commissioner Madhavi Bhatta told The Associated Press. They also have asked the government to revise the rules for investigating, for example, to include torture as a listed crime and to extend the six-month statute of limitations on rape so that decades-old assault allegations can be considered. The committee can only recommend prosecution for government lawyers to pursue; it cannot take such action on its own.

'Victims of crimes'

The Maoists have pledged they will not seek amnesty and would help bring justice for "victims of crimes outside of war rules," according to spokeswoman Pampha Bhusal. "We will not suppress these cases but will resolve them," she said. "We are going to resolve all these issues on the basis of international norms and human rights and the peace agreement we signed." Victims and rights groups expressed doubt about the Maoists' sincerity. In one of their recent pushes for a general amnesty, the Maoists in May forced then-Prime Minister Khadga Prasad Oli to sign an agreement saying the government would "immediately initiate the process to withdraw or give clemency on insurgency-era cases and other politically-motivated cases filed on various occasions."

And former Maoist parliament member Bal Krishna Dhugel was convicted in 2010 of a 1998 murder, but Maoist pressure and a pending clemency request have ensured he remains free despite a Supreme Court order this year not to grant him amnesty. Analysts said the Maoists would have trouble pushing for a blanket amnesty. They do not have the necessary parliamentary majority to vote such an amnesty into law, and even the suggestion could upset their coalition partners and undermine the stability of their government. — AP

CHINA PRESIDENT RESHUFFLES KEY PARTY POSTS AHEAD OF CONGRESS

XI PLACES HIS MEN IN KEY POSITIONS

BEIJING: Chinese President Xi Jinping has reshuffled three top provincial-level Communist Party posts as he seeks to place his men in key positions ahead of a once-every-five-years congress next year, and more new appointments are likely soon. The party congress, expected to be held next autumn, will see Xi further cement his hold on power by appointing close allies into the party's ruling inner core, the 25-member Politburo and the seven-member Politburo Standing Committee.

Xi, who doubles as Communist Party and military chief, is ranked No 1 in the Standing Committee - the apex of power in China. The year leading up to that will focus on Xi appointing more new people into major provincial party and government positions, sources with ties to the leadership say. In a brief dispatch on Sunday, the official Xinhua news agency named two people with whom Xi had previously worked as the new party chiefs in the strategically located southwestern province of Yunnan and the populous southern province of Hunan. The provincial party chief outranks the governor.

In Yunnan, bordering Myanmar, Laos and Vietnam, Chen Hao replaced Li Jiheng, while in

Hunan, Du Jiahao had assumed the party's top job, Xinhua said. Both Chen and Du worked with Xi when he ran China's commercial capital, Shanghai, as its Communist Party chief for a year in 2007, according to their resumes. "Xi is close to both of them due to their time together in Shanghai," a source with ties to the leadership told Reuters, speaking on condition of anonymity.

Tibet, considered one of the country's most politically sensitive positions due to periodic anti-Chinese unrest in the devoutly Buddhist Himalayan region, also has a new party chief, named by Xinhua as Wu Yingjie. Wu has spent almost his entire career in Tibet, according to his official resume, having previously served as a deputy governor and propaganda chief, among other roles. Wu, like his predecessor Chen Quanguo, belongs to China's majority Han Chinese ethnic group. China says its rule has brought prosperity and stability to Tibet, rejecting claims from Tibetan exiles and rights groups of widespread repression.

Xinhua said on Monday that Chen would move to Xinjiang as its party boss, another unruly part of the country, due to what the government says is a concerted Islamist-backed campaign of violence in a region with a large ethnic minority Muslim population. The current party boss, Zhang Chunxian, is expected to move to Beijing to take over a senior role in a party building committee that Xi is overseeing as part of his efforts to instill greater discipline in the corruption-racked party, the source added. Xinhua said Zhang would be given another post, but did not say what. A second source said the governor in Shanxi, a coal-rich northern province beset by corruption scandals, would move to Beijing to take over as transport minister.

Li Xiaopeng is the son of former premier Li Peng, who was deeply involved in the military crackdown on student-led demonstrations for democracy around Beijing's Tiananmen Square in 1989. The second source said Xi ally Lou Yangsheng, currently a deputy party boss in Shanxi, would be named acting provincial governor, pending approval by the local legislature. Xi and Lou worked together when Xi was party boss in the eastern province of Zhejiang from 2003 until early 2007. The State Council Information Office, which doubles as the party's spokesman's office, did not respond to a request for comment. — Reuters

WATCHDOG CALLS OUT INDIA FOR FAILING TO PROTECT JOURNALISTS

NEW DELHI: India is failing to help and protect journalists who are facing violent threats or attacks for their work, an international watchdog agency said yesterday, noting a pattern of resistance in investigating crimes targeting reporters. The Committee to Protect Journalists counted 27 journalists killed for their work since 1992, and noted that it was still investigating more than two dozen cases to determine whether those journalists' deaths were also work-related. Most at risk are small-town journalists investigating corruption, rather than journalists in big cities like New Delhi or Mumbai.

The New York-based watchdog said in a report released yesterday that it could find only one case in 10 years in India in which a suspect was prosecuted and convicted for killing a journalist, but that the suspect was later released on appeal. "Perpetrators are seldom arrested," said Sujata Madhok, a member of the watchdog. "The torturously slow Indian judicial system, together with corruption in the police force and the criminalization of politics, makes it possible to literally get away with murder."

The watchdog's findings are supported by another report, released in 2015 by India's own media watchdog, the Press Council of India. That report found that even though the country's democratic institutions and independent judiciary were strong, people who killed journalists were getting away with impunity. "The situation is truly alarming," the Press Council said, warning that the trend could

hurt India's democracy, and pressing Parliament to pass a nationwide law ensuring journalists' safety.


The Committee to Protect Journalists blamed successive Indian governments and local officials for doing little to address a problem that has existed for decades. It noted that while newspaper

reports on corruption scandals made for attention-grabbing headlines, those same corruption investigations tended to end abruptly if an involved journalist was killed. "No government in India has been an ardent champion of press freedom," the report said. — AP

IS ATTACK KILLS 71 IN YEMEN

Witnesses said some recruits were buried when a roof collapsed after the blast which left a gaping hole on the building's facade. Debris was scattered around the complex and nearby buildings were damaged. The assault killed at least 71 people and wounded 98, medical sources told AFP. They could not immediately verify whether all those who died were army recruits. Doctors Without Borders (MSF) said on Twitter that its hospital in Aden "received 45 dead and at least 60 wounded" following the explosion.

Aden has experienced a wave of bombings and shootings targeting officials and security forces. Attacks in the city are often claimed by jihadists from either Al-Qaeda or IS, which have both taken advantage of the chaos in Yemen to make gains in the south and southeast. IS claimed yesterday's bombing on its official propaganda outlet, Amaq. Earlier this month, a suicide bomber drove his vehicle into a large group of army reinforcements sent from Aden to fight jihadists in neighboring Lahj, killing five soldiers, military officials said. No group has claimed that attack.

But on July 20, four policemen were killed in a bombing attack in Aden that was claimed by IS. And in May, twin suicide bombings in Aden claimed by IS killed at least 41 people. Yemeni authorities have trained hundreds of soldiers in the city over the past two months as part of operations to retake neighbouring southern provinces from jihadists. Earlier this month, government forces backed by a Saudi-led coalition entered Abyan's

provincial capital of Zinjibar.

Troops retook other towns across Abyan but have been met by fierce resistance in the key Al-Qaeda stronghold of Al-Mahfid, security sources said. The militants still have a presence in areas surrounding the recaptured towns and control large parts of neighboring Shabwa province, the sources say. The Arab coalition battling the rebels and their allies in Yemen has also been providing troops with air cover throughout their war against the jihadists.

The United States has carried out numerous drone strikes against Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) operatives in Yemen. The Saudi-led coalition intervened in Yemen in March last year and have helped government forces push the rebels out of Aden and four other southern provinces since July 2015. The war in Yemen has also impacted security in Saudi Arabia, where shelling from the kingdom's impoverished neighbor killed three Saudi children and wounded nine other people on Sunday. Cross-border attacks from Yemen have intensified since the suspension in early August of UN-brokered peace talks between the rebels and the Saudi-backed government.

A plane chartered by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) landed at Sanaa airport yesterday, carrying insulin for thousands of people suffering from diabetes. "Yemen's health sector is in a terrible state," said the head of the ICRC in Yemen, Alexandre Faite. "Less than 30 percent of the required medicines and medical supplies have entered Yemen in 2015," he added. — AFP

The government action raised question marks over the "rule of institutions" in the state, he said, charging that it was a "personal" campaign. "They have to understand that what was taken by force from us today shall be taken back tomorrow by the rule of law and the justice of the cause and the support of the international and local Olympic movement."

The sports commission is headed by Youth and Information Minister Sheikh Salman Sabah Al-Salem Al-Hmoud Al-Sabah, who has sought greater control over Kuwait's sports bodies. The IOC and FIFA suspended Kuwait last October over a law giving the government the right to intervene in sports bodies. A new law was passed in June but the IOC said this only increased government powers. The IOC and FIFA maintain that Sheikh Talal is the legitimate head of the two associations.

The IOC yesterday strongly condemned the actions of Kuwaiti authorities. "The IOC strongly condemns

these actions which, regrettably, continue to worsen the situation instead of helping to find solutions," said a letter sent by the IOC after the police action. A copy of the letter, sent to Sheikh Salman, was obtained by AFP. "The IOC will hold the government authorities responsible for any loss or damage to the KOC properties and assets, in particular those derived from IOC/Olympic Movement funding," the letter warned. The IOC letter said the Olympic movement would not recognize any of the "the so-called 'interim committee' appointed by government authorities in place of the duly elected office-bearers".

The Asian Football Confederation has also told its members not to cooperate with the new leadership of the KFA. The IOC said it was "still hoping that reason and common sense will prevail" in the standoff. "The IOC calls on the highest authorities of Kuwait to work constructively and responsibly on a solution ... instead of taking actions which have no effect other than to make the situation worse," said the letter. — Agencies

by the illness of the Uzbek president" and was being kept informed of his state through diplomatic channels and the media. "We value our relationship with Uzbekistan," said Peskov.

"In this case we would really like to receive only positive news on the president's state of health."

Karimov lacks a clear successor after being re-elected to a fifth term in 2015 with more than 90 percent of the vote. The country has never held an election judged free and fair by international monitors. Those tipped to rule in the case of Karimov's long illness or death include Prime Minister Shavkat Mirziyoyev and Deputy Prime Minister Rustam Azimov, Kamoliddin Rabbimov, an independent Uzbek political analyst based in France told AFP.

"I think in the corridors of power they have already started fighting," Rabbimov said, while predicting the elite will be keen to ensure the transition is "more or less stable". "On the one hand the political elite is fighting each other and regrouping but on the other, they understand they need to keep control of the country. They have gained massive wealth under Karimov."

Karimov's elder daughter Gulnara, a flamboyant figure formerly seen as a potential successor, was reportedly placed under house arrest in 2014 after she openly criticized officials and family members on Twitter. Karimova accused her mother and younger sister of sorcery, compared her father to Stalin and attacked the country's powerful security chief for corruption and harboring presidential ambitions.

Gulnara was "hyperactive, but her ambition was not shared within the family, by her mother and sister," said analyst Rabbimov, while her sister Karimova-Tillyaeva has "no ambitions" for the presidential role. Karimov's younger daughter Karimova-Tillyaeva is based in Paris. She revealed in a 2013 interview that she had not spoken to Gulnara for 12 years. Karimov grew up in an orphanage in the ancient city of Samarkand and went on to study mechanical engineering and economics. He rose up through the Communist Party ranks to head Soviet Uzbekistan in 1989.

His career longevity equals that of the more moderately authoritarian leader of neighboring Kazakhstan, 76-year-old Nursultan Nazarbayev. Karimov has long been condemned by rights activists for his crackdown on dissent - most notoriously in 2005 in the city of Andijan, where government forces are accused of killing hundreds of demonstrators. Facing a wave of international criticism over the alleged massacre, which Karimov's regime rebuffed, Tashkent shut down a US military base used to supply operations in neighboring Afghanistan since 2001. — AFP

Washington had told the YPG to go back across the Euphrates or risk losing American support. But Ankara says it had seen no evidence of this. "The YPG... needs to cross east of the Euphrates as soon as possible. So long as they don't, they will be a target," said Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu. "In the places where it has moved, the YPG forces everyone out - including Kurds - who do not think like it does, and carries out ethnic cleansing," he added.

Cavusoglu said the pre-war ethnic composition of the area around the city of Manbij west of the Euphrates - captured by the YPG from IS earlier this month - was largely Arab and must not be changed. Turkey accuses the YPG of being an offshoot of Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) which has waged a deadly insurgency on Turkish territory for over three decades. Yesterday, the Turkish air force launched air strikes on PKK targets at their rear bases in northern Iraq, the first since the Syria operation began, state media said.

state media said.

The Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said at least 40 civilians were killed in Turkish shelling and air strikes in northern Syria on Sunday, claims strongly rejected by Ankara. The Turkish government said 13 villages had "been cleared of terrorist elements" and were now controlled by anti-regime Syrian fighters that Ankara refers to as the Free Syrian Army (FSA). Ankarabacked forces captured the IS border stronghold of Jarabulus last week, facing seemingly little resistance from

the jihadists who fled to bases further south.

But the standoff with the Kurdish militia has been intense, with a Turkish soldier killed on Saturday in a YPG rocket attack on his tank. Pentagon spokesman Peter Cook said the reported clashes were "unacceptable and a source of deep concern". "The United States was not involved in these activities, they were not coordinated with US forces, and we do not support them," he said. He called for steps to de-escalate the situation and said Washington had once again told the YPG to retreat east of the Euphrates. This has "largely occurred," he added.

The Jarabulus military council - affiliated to the YPG-dominated Syrian Democratic Forces (SDF) - said its forces have withdrawn south of the Sajur River, 20 km south of Jarabulus "to protect the lives of civilians". This goes some way to meeting Turkish demands but it still leaves SDF-affiliated forces in and north of Manbij west of the Euphrates. The Turkish army said in a statement said it had fired 61 times on 20 targets in northern Syria in the last 24 hours. It did not say which group was targeted.

Deputy Prime Minister Numan Kurtulmus confirmed one of the key aims of its unprecedented operation was to prevent the creation of a YPG-controlled corridor stretching from Iraq to the verge of the Mediterranean. "If that happens, it means Syria has been divided," he added, quoted by NTV television. He said all relevant parties had been informed of Turkey's operation in Syria, including the regime of President Bashar Al-Assad, a bitter enemy of Ankara who had been informed by its ally Russia. — AFP

THREAT GROWS FOR BITCOIN EXCHANGES

hen hackers penetrated a secure authentication system at a bitcoin exchange called Bitfinex earlier this month, they stole about \$70 million worth of the virtual currency. The cyber theft - the second largest by an exchange since hackers took roughly \$350 million in bitcoins at Tokyo's MtGox exchange in early 2014 - is hardly a rare occurrence in the emerging world of crypto-currencies. New data disclosed to Reuters shows a third of bitcoin trading platforms have been hacked, and nearly half have closed in the half dozen years since they burst on the scene.

This rising risk for bitcoin holders is compounded by the fact there is no depositor's insurance to absorb the loss, even though many exchanges act like virtual banks. Not only does that approach cast the cyber security risk in stark relief, but it also exposes the fact that bitcoin investors have little choice but to do business with under-capitalized exchanges that may not have the capital buffer to absorb these losses the way a traditional and

regulated bank or exchange would.

"There is a general sense in the bitcoin community that any centralized repository is at risk," said a US-based professional trader who lost about \$1,000 in bitcoins when Bitfinex was hacked. He declined to be named for this article. "So when investing, you always have that expectation at the back of your head. I lost a small amount compared to the others, but I know of traders who lost millions of dollars worth of bitcoins," the trader

The security challenge for the bitcoin world does not appear to be letting up, according to experts in the currency. "I am skeptical there's going to be any technological silver bullet that's going to solve security breach problems. No technology, cryptocurrency, or financial mechanism can be made safe from hacks," said Tyler Moore, assistant professor of cyber security at the University of Tulsa's Tandy School of Computer Science who will soon publish the new research on the vulnerability of bitcoin

His study, funded by the US Department of Homeland Security and shared with Reuters, shows that since bitcoin's creation in 2009 to March 2015, 33 percent of all bitcoin exchanges operational during that period were hacked. The figure represents one of the first estimates of the extent of security breaches in the bitcoin world. In contrast, data from the Privacy Rights Clearinghouse, a non-profit organization, showed that of the 6,000 operational US banks, only 67 banks experienced a publicly-disclosed data breach between 2009 and 2015. That's roughly 1 percent of US banks.

Among the world's stock exchanges, however, security breaches are much higher, with hackers attracted to the large pools of cash moving in and out of these trading venues. The latest survey of 46 securities exchanges released three years ago by the International Organization of Securities Commissions and World Federation of Exchanges found that more than half had experienced a cyberattack.

Moore collaborated on the research with Nicolas Christin, associate research professor at Carnegie Mellon University and Janos Szurdi, a PhD student also at Carnegie. In 2013, Moore and Christin wrote a research paper on security risks surrounding bitcoin exchanges when Moore was still a professor at Southern Methodist University. That research entitled "Beware of the Middleman: Empirical Analysis of Bitcoin Exchange Risk" was peer-reviewed and presented at the 17th International Financial Cryptography and Data Security Conference in Okinawa, Japan in 2013.

Recovering Losses

In the most recent study, the rate of closure for bitcoin exchanges in Moore's research edged up to 48 percent among those operating from 2009 to March 2015. Hacking did not necessarily trigger the closure in each case. "A 48 percent closure is not acceptable, but not surprising given that bitcoin is a new technology," said Richard Johnson, vice president of market structure and technology at Greenwich Associates. Johnson has written reports on risk and security issues in the crypto-currency world.

Profitability is a big problem for bitcoin exchanges, with many of them unable to generate enough volume to keep afloat. Bitcoin exchanges overall could be launched for as low as \$100,000 up to \$1 million, said Erik Voorhees, founder and chief executive officer of digital currency exchange ShapeShift. That is a fraction of what US forex exchanges' are required to put up. Retail FX trading platform FXCM, for instance, is required by the Commodity Futures Trading Commission to have at least \$25 million in capital at all times.

A key factor tied to the risk posed by exchanges is whether customers are reimbursed after closure or after the loss of bitcoins following a hack. Each closure and breach have been handled differently, but Tandy's Moore said the risk of losing funds stored in exchanges are real. In the case of Bitfinex, which is now up and running after the hack August 2, customers lost 36 percent of the assets they had on the platform and were compensated for the losses with tokens of credit that would be converted into equity in the parent company.—Reuters

NEW TANS, SAME OLD 'POLYCRISIS' IN EUROPE

he European Union grinds back into action this week after its August break, still dazed by Britain's midsummer vote to quit the EU and facing much the same "polycrisis" as a year ago: A mass of refugees, a fragile economy, hostile Russians and, yes, those Brits, now more awkward than ever. When President Jean-Claude Juncker makes his annual State of the Union address to Parliament in Strasbourg on Sept 14, he might easily repeat last year's warning: the EU had a "last chance" to save itself from a tide of centrifugal nationalisms.

Last week, the EU's remaining Big Three - German Chancellor Angela Merkel, French President Francois Hollande and their host, Italian Prime Minister Matteo Renzi - felt they needed to renew their vows at the well-spring of the union, the island of Ventotene, where in 1941 prisoners of Mussolini wrote a manifesto for a united Europe. That they met on the deck of the aircraft carrier Garibaldi reinforced the sense of beleaguered leaders rallying to the EU's defense as they contemplated an obstacle-strewn political calendar for the year ahead.

The EU leaders are first preparing for a summit on Sept 16 in Bratislava - without Britain - that aims to sketch out a post-Brexit future for the Union. On Oct 2, Hungary's rightwing prime minister, Viktor Orban, is set to deliver another slap to Brussels: A largely symbolic referendum to reject an EU quota system for relocating refugees among member states - a scheme Juncker invested much capital in a year ago, but which has barely got off the ground.

Trump

On Nov 8, Orban is hoping for victory for a man he calls the "valiant" Donald Trump in the US presidential election. Few of Orban's EU peers are so enthusiastic. They see Trump as a disruptive maverick whose endorsement of and by Brexiteer-in-chief Nigel Farage marks him as no friend of the Union. A Trump win could snap a transatlantic coalition on Russia that is already fraying in Europe, where governments from Paris to Bratislava are seeking a review of Ukraine-related sanctions when measures expire at year's

end. Trump might also inject a new dose of post-Brexit uncertainty for world trade.

At home, all the Big Three leaders face their own electoral challenges from eurosceptics. It starts with Renzi, today trying to persuade Italians he has the youthful energy for rebuilding after the latest earthquake in the Apennines, unlike the scandal-tainted Silvio Berlusconi at L'Aquila in 2009, when more than 300 people died. Probably in November, Renzi will put to a referendum the constitutional reforms he says are needed to break a political deadlock that is choking the Italian economy. Polls are tight and the eurosceptic upstarts 5-Star are gunning for the socialist premier, who is expected to resign if he loses.

Hollande is threatened with a drubbing on April 23 at the hands of far-right National Front leader Marine Le Pen in the first round of France's presidential election. Her appeal has been enhanced by Islamic State carnage in Paris and Nice and the summer row about burkinis on the beaches, although pollsters doubt she can win a May 7 runoff vote against Hollande or any other survivor from a mainstream party. As for Merkel, she has yet to confirm she wants a fourth term at parliamentary elections due in just over a year. The biggest threat to her re-election remains her decision last year to welcome a million migrants to Germany as EU borders buckled. That has already weakened support for her conservative party.

Hardball

Such threats to domestic survival have often spurred leaders to take potshots at Brussels - even if only the British have taken it to the length of turning most voters against the EU entirely. But even if little has changed in Brussels since last summer, optimists might see reason to hope for more unity now. While rows go on about how, indeed whether, EU states should share out the burden of asylum-seekers stranded in Greece and Italy, what is new is how few are arriving, at least in Greece.

Rights groups were outraged this year by hard-nosed deals with non-EU Balkan states to bar the routes north from Greece and with Turkey to stop Syrian refugees reaching Greece in the first place. But those deals did

slash the numbers arriving. It's something EU officials find hard to boast of. Many admit privately to unease at policies that, along with efforts to pay African governments to stop people setting off for Italy, sit uncomfortably with the Union's lofty humanitarian ideals.

But look again at Merkel, Hollande and Renzi on the Garibaldi, flagship of an EU mission off Libya that is part rescue operation and military deterrent against people smugglers, and a slightly different image of today's EU emerges.

EU Army

All three spoke of Europe getting tougher and more cohesive on security. It is the kind of language that may resonate with sceptical voters dissatisfied with Europe's struggle to thrive in a globalising world and with the likes of Orban and other eastern leaders alarmed by Merkel's earlier open-door policy. Relieved of the need to keep Britons from bolting, Juncker wrung howls of outrage last week from London's europhobic press when he called national borders "the worst invention ever". He also renewed his call for a "European army", which was long just a pipe dream for the Luxemburger as long as Britain had a veto.

The past few days have seen Merkel and a succession of other leaders she has met, including Orban, echo such hopes of joint military structures, indicating one area where EU integration may now forge ahead in response to the British departure. That still leaves a host of issues dividing European leaders in the coming year: whether to be nice or nasty to Britain once it decides to open negotiations; how to shore up weaknesses in the economic cooperation that underpins the euro; how far to ease sanctions in the hope of better ties with Moscow.

Consensus will be a tall order. Merkel, standing on the deck of the Garibaldi, cited security, investment and youth opportunities as three priorities for a post-Brexit new start for a Europe united and strong. But, she warned: "Danger exists, of fragmentation, of selfishness, of retreating into ourselves." —Reuters

TAPE REKINDLES MEMORY OF IRAN MASS EXECUTION

he scratchy, echo-filled tape recording carries the voice of a man who once was in line to become Iran's supreme leader, talking about one of the darkest moments of the country's post-revolution history still not recognized by its government. The recording has Grand Ayatollah Hossein Ali Montazeri condemning Iran's execution of thousands of prisoners at the end of the country's bloody war with Iraq in 1988. He warns those gathered they've committed "the biggest crime in the history of the Islamic Republic," while criticizing them for misleading the country's then-ailing supreme leader, Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini.

The criticisms by Montazeri, who lived for years under house arrest and died of natural causes after Iran's disputed 2009 presidential election, long ago surfaced in his own memoirs and writings. But the furor ignited by the release of the tapes by his family this month expose the lingering, unhealed wounds of the chaotic years that followed Iran's 1979 Islamic Revolution, as well as politics now at play in the greater Middle East.

"All advice and criticism from my father was for saving the ruling system - which he had paid so much for," his son, Ahmad Montazeri, recently wrote online. In 1985, Montazeri was selected as Khomeini's successor. But Montazeri's calls for the loosening of clerical control in Iran drew the ire of hardliners - and then came the executions. They happened at the end of Iran's long war with Iraq, which began when Saddam Hussein invaded in 1980. By 1988, one million people had been killed in a conflict that featured trench warfare, Iranian human-wave attacks and chemical weapons assaults launched by Iraq.

In July 1988, Khomeini accepted a UN-bro-

kered ceasefire, calling it "more deadly to me than poison". But within days, members of the Iranian opposition group Mujahedeen-e-Khalq, heavily armed by Saddam, stormed across the Iranian border in a surprise attack. Iran ultimately blunted their assault, but the attack set the stage for the sham retrials of political prisoners, militants and others that would become known as "death commissions". Some who appeared were asked to identify themselves. Those who responded "mujahedeen" were sent to their deaths, while others were questioned about their willingness to "clear minefields for the army of the Islamic Republic," according to a 1990 Amnesty International report.

International rights groups estimate that as many as 5,000 people were executed, while

the MEK puts the number at 30,000. Iran has never fully acknowledged the executions, apparently carried out on Khomeini's orders, though some argue that other top officials were effectively in charge in the months before his 1989 death. This month, a website run in Montazeri's honor by his family released the audio. In it, the ayatollah apparently addresses prosecutors, a judge and an intelligence official over the executions, warning they will tarnish Khomeini's image.

'Biggest Crime'

"I believe that the biggest crime in the history of the Islamic Republic, which will be condemned by history, happened by your hands," Montazeri says. He goes on to say that "fighting against ideology with killing is total-

ly wrong." He mentions the death of his son, Mohammad, in the 1981 bombing of the Islamic Republican Party's headquarters in Tehran, which killed at least 72 people. Iran blamed the attack on the MEK, and the US State Department also has said the group was responsible for it. "I got hurt more than anybody from them; they killed my son," Montazeri says.

Shortly after the audio's release, the website took it down. By that point, however, the clip had circulated online as Farsi-language media began reporting on it, sparking criticism of Montazeri's family for releasing it. "My motivation for publishing this file, as I said for several times to many media, was to defend the truth and innocence of Ayatollah Montazeri," his son, Ahmad, recently wrote.

Conflict

The audio now has found its way into the wider conflict between Shiite power Iran and Sunni-ruled Saudi Arabia. Relations between the two nations soured in January after the kingdom executed a prominent Shiite cleric and angry demonstrators in Iran responded by attacking two Saudi diplomatic posts. Saudi Arabia severed diplomatic ties with Iran over the attacks, though relations already were strained by the countries supporting opposing sides in Syria's long war and the conflict in Yemen.

In the time since, state television in Saudi Arabia, which is among the world's top executioners, repeatedly has aired a program about the 1988 executions in Iran, complete with a graphic of a figure hanging from the Iranian flag. It also aired video of Maryam Rajavi, the leader of the MEK's political arm, throwing flower petals at pictures of those killed in the 1988 executions at an exhibition in Paris. —AP

LONDON: Southampton have signed attacking midfielder Sofiane Boufal from Ligue 1 side Lille on a five-year contract for a club-record fee, the Premier League club said yesterday. The 22-year-old scored 12 goals in 34

appearances for Lille last season, helping them reach the French League Cup final and finish fifth in the Ligue 1 table. Financial details of the transfer were undisclosed but British media reported that Southampton paid 21 million pounds(\$27.5 million) to land the Moroccan international. "I'm very, very happy to sign for Southampton and I am really excited to play in St Mary's Stadium in front of the fans," Boufal told the club's website (www.saintsfc.co.uk). "Southampton showed big interest in signing me, and I can see that this club is the best place for me to con-

can see that this club is the best place for me to continue my progression as a footballer."

Southampton travel to Arsenal in their next Premier League game on Sept 10. — Reuters

COWBOYS ROMO HAS BROKEN BONE IN BACK

NEW YORK: Dallas Cowboys quarterback Tony Romo suffered a broken bone in his back on the third play of Thursday night's preseason game and coach Jason Garrett said the injury would cost the veteran a chunk of the 2016 season. An MRI on Friday revealed Romo's back injury is much worse than anticipated, Garrett announced Saturday, two days after he was knocked out of the game against the Seattle Seahawks. "We're confident that he's going to be coming back and playing football for us this year," Garrett said but provided no timetable on Romo's possible return. A source told NFL Media's Ian Rapoport that the best-case scenario for Romo's return is during the middle of the season. According to a Pro Football Talk source with knowledge of the situation, Romo is expected to miss six to 10 weeks. Romo underwent a pair of back surgeries in 2013 and he missed most of last season with a twice-broken left collarbone. Garrett said the injury is not related to the surgeries Romo had in 2013. The Cowboys went 4-12 last season, including 1-11 with three backup quarterbacks, as Romo missed 12 games. — Reuters

MR FUJI, WWE HALL OF FAMER, DIED AT 82

LOS ANGELES: Harry Fujiwara, best known by his ring name Mr Fuji and who pioneered in WWE as an entertainer and manager, died Sunday morning, WWE announced. He was 82. "WWE is saddened to learn that WWE Hall of Famer Harry Fujiwara, known to WWE fans as Mr. Fuji, passed away this morning at the age of 82," WWE said on a statement on its website. "His career will be remembered by different generations for different reasons but Mr Fuji, whether as a Superstar or manager, is one of the most entertaining performers in the history of WWE." Mr Fuji spent more than 30 years with the organization, and helped expand the sport to the mainstream. The entertainer was born in Honolulu in 1935, and began his wrestling career in 1965 under the name Mr Fujiwara. After he began to gain notoriety in Hawaii, he shortened his name to Mr Fuji and started to compete on the West Coast. ARIYA JUTANUGARN WINS IN CANADA FOR 5TH LPGA TITLE

PRIDDIS: Five months after giving away a major championship with a late meltdown, Ariya Jutanugarn ran away with the Canadian Pacific Women's Open at chilly Priddis Greens for her fifth victory in 10 events.

Jutanugarn made a 12-birdie putt on the final hole for a 6-under 66 and a four-stroke victory over South Korea's Sei Young Kim. The 20-year-old Thai player won nine days after withdrawing from the Rio Olympics because of a left knee injury, a problem that almost forced her to skip the event. "I feel like I'm going to withdraw this week because my knee hurt so bad last week," Jutanugarn said. "But when I got here on Monday and Tuesday, it's getting a lot better, and first round it's fine."

Bundled up in a winter jacket between shots with the temperature in the lows 50s on the over-

cast afternoon, the second-ranked Jutanugarn broke a tie with top-ranked Lydia Lo for the LPGA Tour victory lead. Jutanugarn focused on having fun - and did. Blasting 2-iron and 3-wood off the driving holes on the tree-lined course, she birdied the par-5 seventh and par-3 eighth to get to 19 under, then pulled away with birdies on the par-5 12th, par-4 14th, par-3 15th and par-5 18th.

"I felt like I wanted to have fun and be happy," Jutanugarn said. "No matter what's going to happen, I can handle it." That wasn't the case all that long ago. In April at the ANA Inspiration in the California desert, Jutanugarn - at the time, best known for blowing a two-stroke lead with a closing triple bogey at age 17 in the 2013 LPGA Thailand - bogeyed the final three holes to hand

the major title to Ko.

Jutanugarn rebounded in a big way, breaking

through in May with three straight victories in Alabama, Virginia and Michigan. She won the Women's British Open in the event before the Olympics, and made it two in a row on the tour Sunday in the foothills of the Canadian Rockies.

"After I won my first tournament, I feel like I reached my goal, and after that I feel like I don't care like what my ranking going to be. I don't care if I'm going to win the tournament or not. The only thing I want to be is I really want to be happy on the course." She has five victories in 10 events a year after missing 10 straight cuts. "I just feel like at that time, the only focus, 'I'm scared to miss the cut. I really want to make the cut,"" Jutanugarn said. "But after that I feel like I changed my focus, so right now my focus is like what's going to be good, like what I have to do to be good, so I'm thinking about like what is under my control, not

thinking about like anything else." Jutanugarn matched the tournament record for relation of 23 under set by So Yeon Ryu two years ago at London Hunt in Ontario and the mark for strokes of 265 set by Ryu and also accomplished by Ko in

2013 at par-70 Royal Mayfair in Edmonton. Kim, a two-time winner this year, closed with a 65. South Korea's In Gee Chun, the 2015 U.S. Women's Open champion, was third at 18 under after a 69. Canada's Alena Sharp had the best result of her LPGA Tour career, birdieing the final

two holes for a 67 to finish fourth at 16 under.
"I can't really describe how great it feels to
play this well in Canada," said Sharp, from
Hamilton, Ontario. Australia's Karrie Webb (64)
and Sweden's Anna Nordqvist (68) tied for fifth at
15 under. Webb won the 1999 du Maurier Classic,
the then-major championship that folded

because of Canada's restrictions on tobacco promotions, at Priddis Greens. She was second behind Suzann Pettersen at the course in 2009.

"On the back nine, everything went in," Webb said. Three-time champion Ko had a 69 to tie for seventh at 13 under. "I was a little far away going into today," the 19-year-old New Zealander said. "But it's been a great week."

She won three of the previous four years, the first two as an amateur. Canadian star Brooke Henderson shot a 69 to tie for 14th at 11 under. The 18-year-old from Smith Falls, Ontario, is already thinking about next year's tournament at Ottawa Hunt. "We recently became members at the Ottawa Hunt, so it's my home golf course," Henderson said. "It's only 45 minutes from my house." She also will play in her home province next week in the Manulife LPGA Classic in Cambridge. — AP

LANGER WINS BOEING CLASSIC PLAYOFF TITLE

SNOQUALMIE: By the time Bernhard Langer made the turn in the final round of the Boeing Classic, he was five shots out if the lead. At one point Sunday he was tied for 14th after not finishing lower than 13th in any tournament this year. A few hours later, Langer had outlasted Kevin Sutherland and Woody Austin in a playoff and was celebrating his fourth PGA Tour Champions victory this season and 29th overall on the 50-and-over tour.

"I blew tournaments when I had a lead and I've come from seven behind, so you just never know," Langer said. Langer made a 3-foot birdie putt on the first hole of a playoff with Austin and Sutherland to win the Boeing Classic for the second time. A day after his 59th birthday, Langer birdied the par-5 18th in regulation for a 5-under 67 to match Austin and Sutherland at 13-under 203 at TPC Snoqualmie Ridge. Austin also had a 67, and Sutherland shot 64, the low round of the week.

It took a special stretch for Langer to recover from a shaky front nine where he needed a few lengthy par putts to stay on the edge of contention. Langer went out in 1-over 37, but played the back nine in 6-under 30, also making birdies on Nos. 10-13 and 15.

"When he gets hot with that broom," Austin said in reference to Langer's putter, "you can't beat that broom." Langer tied Lee Trevino for second on the career victory, still well behind leader Hale Irwin at 45. Langer also won the Boeing Classic in 2010.

Langer took advantage of Austin and Sutherland both finding bunkers on the 18th in the playoff. Sutherland ended up in a

bunker off the tee, while Austin's second to the par 5 found a greenside bunker. Langer's second shot landed 10 yards short of the green and he nearly chipped in for eagle before making the birdie putt to win.

"You need to be precise and have the nerve and play the golf course the way it needs to be played," Langer said. "There's still a little bit of life left in me."


Gene Sauers, the second-round leader and US Senior Open winner two weeks ago, shot a 72 to finish a shot out of the playoff. Sauers started his day with two straight birdies to reach 14 under. But he struggled on the back nine, bogeying three of the first five holes and allowed the chase group to catch up. Sauers was still in contention until making bogey at the 17th after his tee shot came up short. Sauers made birdie at the 18th to finish alone in fourth.

While Langer rolled through the back nine, Austin was hot on the front nine going out in 32. His first mistake of the round came at the 15th when he went for the green in two on the par 5 unaware he was in a tie for the lead because electronic scoreboards on the back nine were not working. Austin found a bunker and ended up making bogey.

"I would have laid up to the right for sure, absolutely, no question," said Austin, who birdied Nos. 17 and 18 to get into the playoff.

Sutherland started the day seven shots behind Sauers and made eight birdies with no bogeys in his round. Sutherland was attempting to win his first stroke-play tournament on either the regular or senior tour. — AP

REED SECURES FIFTH PGA TOUR VICTORY

NEW YORK: Patrick Reed ended a frustrating run when he survived two late bogeys to clinch a one-stroke victory at The Barclays on Sunday. Reed carded a closing 70 to finish on nine-under 275 at Bethpage Black in Farmingdale on New York's Long Island. Fellow American Sean O'Hair (66) and Argentine Emiliano Grillo (69) were joint second on eight-under. Reed's victory was his fifth PGA tour title and first in 19 months. It also secured a spot on the United States team for next month's Ryder Cup.

He also vaulted to the top of the FedExCup points list after the first of the four playoff events. Reed was delighted with his win but acknowledged his game needed work after he recorded bogeys at the 16th and 18th holes.

He nearly bogeyed the 17th as well, sinking a six-footer for par to preserve a two-shot lead going to the last. "I have worked pretty hard with my coach for the past couple of weeks," the 26-year-old said in a greenside interview.

"The game shows I'm moving in the right direction but there are some things I need to work on." Reed later said that short stretches of poor play had cost him several chances to win in recent times, but the difference on Sunday was that he had a cushion coming down the stretch. "Its been ... frustrating, because I can easily just pinpoint

through almost every event a three-hole or a nine-hole or a couple shots here or there that cost me, instead of finishing 10th or seventh or fifth into a W.

"At the procure started building there coming down

"As the pressure started building there coming down 15, really 14, I just had a couple loose iron shots, a couple loose tee shots, that kind of cost me. "You know, to build yourself a lead to come down the last couple was huge, especially around a place like this, because those last holes are just so difficult."

Joint runner-up Grillo, who finished tied for 13th at the PGA Championship at Baltusrol last month, had thought pre-tournament that seven-under would have a chance of winning on a public course that bears a warning sign that it is "only for highly skilled players". He finished eight-under, but came up just short. "It wasn't a US Open but it was almost like one," he said of the tough layout. — Reuters

PREMIERSHIP BOSSES SLAM 'LUDICROUS' LIONS SCHEDULE

LONDON: Senior figures within English rugby union have hit out at the "ludicrous" fixture schedule for next year's British and Irish Lions tour of New Zealand.

The Lions, a combined side comprised of the best players from England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales, traditionally go on tour every four years to one of the southern hemisphere giants of New Zealand, South Africa and Australia.

Next year sees the Lions travel to New Zealandwhere they have won just one Test series and that 45 years ago-with three internationals against the of a 10-match tour.

However, their first match takes place at the start of June just a week after the English Premiership and Celtic League finals.

In an age of ever-more gruelling seasons, there are widespread concerns that the Lions will have insufficient time to prepare and are being set up to fail, especially as the scratch team will face what is generally regarded as one of the best sides in New Zealand's outstanding rugby history. And with players in England contracted to their clubs, rather

world champion All Blacks forming the centrepiece than the national unions, there are fears among Premiership chiefs that their star names will be in no fit state for the start of the 2017/18 season that follows the Lions tour. "It is ludicrous they are playing 10 games," Mark McCall, the director of rugby at Premiership and European champions Saracens told BBC Radio on Sunday.

"It's going to be tough, and something that needs to be looked at," added McCall, several of whose players are set to be selected for the Lions." The demands of the professional era of rugby union have seen the future of the Lions, who in 2013 ended a 16-year wait for a series win with a 2-1 success in Australia, repeatedly called into question.

Next year, because of the fixture list, the Lions will have limited preparation time and will have to travel to New Zealand in two separate groups, with those taking part in domestic finals travelling to New Zealand in the week of the tour opener. As far as leading British rugby writer Stephen Jones, the long-serving correspondent of the Sunday Times, is concerned, top players will have to head to New Zealand "battered, knackered, beaten up, carrying injury, begging to be injured again". — AFP

SPEEDO USA, THREE OTHER SPONSORS DROP LOCHTE AFTER RIO INCIDENT

NEW YORK: Less than 24 hours after the close of the Rio Olympics, Ryan Lochte took a major financial hit last week for a drunken incident he initially tried to pass off as an armed robbery. In quick succession, four sponsors announced they were dumping the swimmer, who has since apologized and conceded that he embellished what happened during a nowinfamous stop at a Rio gas station.

Swimsuit company Speedo USA, clothing giant Ralph Lauren and skin-care firm Syneron-Candela issued statements less than three hours apart, all with the same message: Lochte is out. Before the day was done, Japanese mattress maker airweave followed suit, essentially wiping out Lochte's income away from the pool.

In addition, Speedo USA said \$50,000 that would've gone to the 12-time Olympic medalist was being donated to Save The Children to benefit needy youngsters in Brazil. "While we have enjoyed a winning relationship with Ryan for over a decade and he has been an important member of the Speedo team, we cannot condone behavior that is counter to the values this brand has long stood for," the prominent swimsuit company said. "We appreciate his many achievements and hope he moves forward and learns from this experience." Ralph Lauren, which provided the Polobranded attire worn by the US team at the opening and closing ceremonies, said it would not be renewing the contract that provided Lochte with financial support leading up to Rio. The statement from airweave said it had a similar arrangement with the swimmer. Both stressed they would continue their support of the US Olympic and Paralympic teams.

Syneron-Candela offers a line of skin-treatment products that deal with issues such as wrinkle reduction.

"We hold our employees to high standards, and we expect the same of our business partners," the company said. Lochte issued a statement through his public relations firm thanking Speedo USA for its long support. He did not immediately address the other companies dropping their endorsements.

"I respect Speedo's decision and am grateful for the opportunities that our partnership has afforded me over the years," Lochte said. Initially, Lochte said he and three teammates -Jack Conger, Gunnar Bentz and Jimmy Feigen were robbed after their taxi was pulled over by armed men posing as police just hours after the swimming competition ended in Rio de Janeiro.

That version quickly unraveled when police said the swimmers, who had attended a late-night party, never reported the incident to authorities and there was scant evidence of

a robbery. Video surveillance emerged showing the athletes getting into a confrontation with armed security guards over alleged vandalism at the gas station when their taxi pulled over to let them use the restroom.

While there have been conflicting versions over whether the guards pulled their weapons on the swimmers, Lochte has since acknowledged he was highly intoxicated and that his behavior led to the confrontation, which resulted in the swimmers paying some \$50 in US and Brazilian currency before they were allowed to leave. The incident caused a furor in Rio, where street crime was a major issue heading into the games.

Paul Swangard, managing director of the Warsaw Sports Marketing Center at the University of Oregon, said he wasn't surprised by the decision since most of Lochte's marketing value was tied to campaigns prior to the Olympics. "I would think it was an easy decision to cut ties now," Swangard said. "For someone like Lochte, he's really destroyed almost all of his short-term marketability. Brands can easily seek out other athletes for the next Olympic cycle." The financial costs of losing Speedo and Ralph Lauren are likely to be only the first sanctions that await Lochte, whose antics tarnished a powerful showing by the American team and dominating news away from the stadiums and arenas in the final days of the Rio Games.

Both the US Olympic Committee and USA Swimming have indicated that Lochte will be punished, perhaps endangering the 32-yearold's hopes of competing in a fifth Olympics at Tokyo in 2020. He could also face criminal charges in Brazil, where the other swimmers were initially barred from leaving the country until they were interviewed by authorities.

Feigen wound up donating just under \$11,000 to a Brazilian nonprofit sports organization to settle any potential legal action. Bentz issued a statement saying Lochte tore a sign off a wall at the gas station and got into a heated exchange with the security officers, though Bentz denied the swimmers did any damage to a locked bathroom as authorities alleged. In the last of three interviews with NBC that included ever-changing accounts of the incident, Lochte apologized and acknowledged he "over-exaggerated the story." He made a similar mea culpa to Brazil's main broadcaster, Globo.

Long one of the most popular US athletes, the laid-back swimmer is known for his trademark saying "Jeah!" and such antics as wearing diamond grillz on the medal stand and dying his hair a silvery color before the Rio Games. Lochte also starred in a short-lived reality television show after the 2012 Olympics. — AP

Hamilton podium sours ROSBERG'S BELGIAN WIN

SPA-FRANCORCHAMPS: Nico Rosberg was handed a much-needed break in the Formula One title battle which he duly converted by winning Sunday's Belgian Grand Prix, but victory could have tasted much sweeter for the German. Rosberg went into the weekend knowing this was his race to lose.

Mercedes team mate and title rival Lewis Hamilton was set to start at the back of the field after taking a planned series of engine-related grid penalties.

That gave Rosberg the perfect opportunity to reignite his title challenge after a run of lacklustre form and make major inroads into the Briton's 19-point advantage in the standings. Instead, he came away still trailing Hamilton by nine points after the reigning triple world champion took full advantage of collisions involving his rivals, race disruptions and some spectacular overtaking, to finish a shock third.

"I just saw at the end after the chequered flag looked at the results and I knew Daniel was behind me and then I see Hamilton in third," said Rosberg, who cruised to a comfortable win from pole-position in a chaotic race ahead of Red Bull's Daniel Ricciardo.

"I was like 'What, seriously?'. I don't know what happened, I haven't looked at the details, but for sure he must have done a great job."

Rosberg, runner-up to Hamilton in 2014 and last year, opened the season with four wins in the first four races. He led Hamilton by 43 points following May's Spanish Grand Prix, but has steadily lost ground to his former childhood friend who blitzed to six wins from seven races leading up to the Belgian Grand Prix.

The race at Spa-Francorchamps was Rosberg's one "free race", as Hamilton referred to it, in which the Briton was set to serve his long-pending engine-related penalties. With the championship now heading to Monza for the Italian Grand Prix, before the Asian leg which Hamilton has dominated the last two years, Rosberg was asked if he had hoped to come away with more from Sunday's race.

That's not what I'm focusing on," he told reporters. "I came here, Belgian Grand Prix, and I wanted to win it. nSo, just happy it worked out, perfect weekend for me." Hamilton, meanwhile, who now has three new engines, was upbeat.

"Definitely things have happened in the right way in that second quarter of the season and to go into the break 19 points ahead and now only lose 10 today I'll take it," he said. — Reuters

FERRARI DRIVERS CRITICISE Verstappen aggression

SPA-FRANCORCHAMPS: A weekend that began at the top of the timesheets for Max Verstappen ended with the Dutchman out of the points and in a war of words with Ferrari rivals after a nightmare Belgian Formula One Grand Prix. The 18-year-old began Sunday's race alongside pole-sitter Nico Rosberg in the first front-row start of his fledgling career.

But any hopes he had of converting his qualifying display into a strong showing in front of legions of his orange-clad supporters, in a race that is the closest he has to a home event, quickly vanished.

Verstappen was leapfrogged by Kimi Raikkonen and Sebastian Vettel off the line but attempted to make the places up on a tight first corner only for the three cars to collide. "I think it was a very bold move trying to recover those two places in one corner diving down the inside," said German Vettel who was on the outside and collided with Raikkonen before the Finn and Verstappen's Red Bull made contact.

All three were forced to pit with damage to their cars, Raikkonen nearly losing a lap as mechanics rushed to extinguish flames emerging from beneath his Ferrari. Raikkonen and Verstappen clashed twice more later in the race, including another collision, and the Finn was more upset about the Red Bull driver changing direction at high-speed as he chased him down the flat-out Kemmel straight.

"If I would not have braked we would have had a massive accident," said Raikkonen who criticised Verstappen over the radio during the race. "I'm sure it will happen sooner or later if this doesn't

Verstappen has impressed with his racecraft and overtaking skills but his driving has at times been called a bit too aggressive, especially in last month's Hungarian Grand Prix where he also clashed with Raikkonen.

The son of former racer Jos, though, said his racecraft had been fair. "I'm just defending my position and if somebody doesn't like it, it's his own problem," added Verstappen who was fastest on the opening day of practice. — Reuters

BARRETT COMMITS TO NZ RUGBY **UNTIL AFTER 2019 WORLD CUP**

WELLINGTON: All Blacks coach Steve Hansen's hopes of winning a third successive World Cup have been boosted by flyhalf Beauden Barrett's decision to commit his immediate playing future to New Zealand Rugby until after the 2019 tournament in Japan. The 25-year-old has been in career-best form this season, helping the Wellington Hurricanes to a maiden Super Rugby title and settling any arguments about who would succeed Dan Carter in the All Blacks' num-

"It's great news for the team and great news for Beauden," Hansen said in a statement. "He's fast becoming one of 'the' players in the world.

"He's been a world-class player coming off the bench for some time, he's now graduated into starting test matches for us, and this year he's been nothing short of spectacular." "He'll continue to grow - he's not the finished product yet, by any stretch of the imagination - but as he does, I think we'll see something pretty special, so it's nice to have him signed up and secure." Barrett, who is the eighth player to sign through until the global showpiece in Japan, will also remain with the Hurricanes until 2019. Local media had reported earlier this year that he was a target for the Auckland Blues, though the Wellingtonbased side said at the time they were certain he would stay in New Zealand's capital.

Originally considered a 'super sub' with his ability to play fullback and blistering pace able to unlock tiring defences, Barrett has seized the starting flyhalf role this season as the All Blacks looked to replace Carter, a three-times World Player of the Year who is now playing club rugby in France. After originally being on the bench for the first two matches of the June series against Wales, Barrett replaced the injured Aaron Cruden for the third game and seized his opportunity, leading the All Blacks to a 46-6 victory. He continued that form as he guided the Hurricanes to the Super Rugby title and has been superb in the All Blacks' first two Rugby Championship clashes against Australia.

"I love playing for the All Blacks and representing my country in the black jersey and I'm loving my footy at the moment," Barrett added.

"The All Blacks are an incredibly special team to be part of and I'm looking forward to playing my role and adding my small part to the legacy over the next few years." — Reuters

IMAD BACKS PAKISTAN TO SHOW ONE-DAY CLASS

LONDON: Pakistan all-rounder Imad third match at Trent Bridge today. Wasim insists his side are determined to show their one-day international credentials after a pair of lacklustre efforts against England.

Imad and his team-mates are ninth in the International Cricket Council one-day rankings after defeats in Southampton and at Lord's left them 2-0 down with three to play against England.

Nevertheless Imad says Azhar Ali's team have it in them to battle back in the

"With the talent we've got, I don't think it's a number nine team," he said. "We have to show that in big matches like

tomorrow. I believe we can come back.

"We have to work hard, trust ourselves and show our skills in front of the cameras." Imad concedes England will be even more formidable with Ben Stokes able to bowl again, after figuring as a specialist batsman only in the first two matches, but he is convinced Pakistan will still

measure up. "He's a great cricketer, a genuine all-rounder and one of the best (in the world)," Imad said yesterday.

"When Ben Stokes is fit to bowl, England are definitely even stronger.

"But if we get ourselves right, we're going to give them a tough time." Former World Cup winners Pakistan have slumped below all other Test-playing nations in the ICC's ODI table and Imad knows it is time to make amends for that

"It's the first time we've ever been number nine in the world," Imad said. "But if we stay united - which we are - we're going to show the cricketing world what we're capable of, just like we did in the Test matches. "We're number one in them, and we're really looking forward to putting our rankings up in the one-dayers."

Imad's career-best 63 not out helped Pakistan recover from two for three at Lord's, where they were then unable to defend 251 all out. The Swansea-born all-

rounder is looking forward already to a weekend return to his native country, for the final match of the series in Cardiff. He knows much hard work will be needed for a happy homecoming, and believes Pakistan must simply cast aside their struggles to date. "It's just cricket, and it can happen to any team," he said.

"We're ready, up for it. Whatever is gone is gone - it's done. "We have to get some runs on the board, and give our bowlers a chance." — AFP

AFTER A SET OFF SERENA, MCHALE AIMS FOR US OPEN SUCCESS

NEW YORK: Since Christina McHale won a first-set tiebreaker against her idol Serena Williams at Wimbledon last month, she's played three tournaments and World Team Tennis to prepare for the US Open.

Before considering a rematch, the New Jersey native needs to defeat first-round opponent Mona Barthel of Germany today.

McHale hasn't advanced past the third round of a Grand Slam, but her confidence grew after a 6-7 (7), 6-2, 6-4 loss to the eventual Wimbledon champion, who earned a record-tying 22nd major singles title. "There were a lot of positives I took from my Serena match," McHale said. "The first and most important for me being that I can compete with the best. That match has really motivated me to keep working and improving."

McHale served well early and kept Williams off balance in winning the tiebreaker during the second-round match at Wimbledon. In the second set, McHale went up 40-15 on serve, with two chances to take a 3-0 lead.

But she double-faulted and Williams ran off 11 straight points. McHale also doublefaulted on a game point and Williams attacked her second serves to break for 5-4.

It was a lesson in thought management for the 24-year-old McHale. "You think about the big picture all of a sudden," Billie Jean King said. "Your brain goes from one ball at a time to, 'Oh crap, I'm up playing for 3-0 and I'm up a set already. I should win this." McHale played nearly every day for two weeks in early August for the New York Empire in the World Team Tennis league cofounded by King. The tennis great knows it's important to stay focused and relaxed during critical points.

"Serena talks about being in the zone," King said. "Everybody understands that means stay in the present and be in the now. It sounds so easy. Before the point is how you tee it up and get ready.

Seventy-five percent of the time in the match, you are not hitting a ball."

McHale started playing tennis in Hong Kong, where she lived from age 3 to 8 and learned to speak Mandarin. She also was a competitive swimmer growing up in Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey. She turned pro in 2010, and last year, she moved to South Florida to train at the USTA National Tennis Center in Boca Raton.

Her older sister Lauren graduated from North Carolina, where she played tennis for the Tar Heels. Lauren is engaged to American tennis player Ryan Harrison.

Christina reached a career-high singles ranking of No. 24 in 2012. She's coached by Jorge Todero, who has guided her the last five years. McHale has posted wins over former No. 1 Caroline Wozniacki and Grand Slam champions Victoria Azarenka, Petra Kvitova and Svetlana Kuznetsova.

"He's gotten me to use my forehand more," McHale said of the Argentine. "I try to hit as many forehands as I can, go to my strength in the pressure moments."

She's currently ranked 55th with a 31-20 record this year. Her first serve percentage is just 59 percent, with 64 percent of those points won. She's had 119 aces and 136 double-faults.

After Wimbledon, McHale upset eighthseeded Monica Niculescu at the Citi Open in Washington in mid-July. She then lost to Jessica Pegula, daughter of Buffalo Bills and Sabres owners Terry and Kim Pegula, 7-5, 6-2. She bowed out in the second round in Montreal at the Rogers Cup, but joined Asia Muhammad to defeat the top-ranked doubles team of Martina Hingis and Sania Mirza 6-3, 6-4 in the quarterfinals before losing in the semifinals.

McHale, who recently reached the second round in Cincinnati, is among 19 American women in the US Open. Next up is Barthel, who she beat in matchups in Seoul in 2014 and Madrid in 2015. If McHale gets past her, she'll play the winner of Roberta Vinci vs. Anna-Lena Friedsam. Vinci took out Williams in the semifinals of the US Open last year, ending the quest for a calendar year Grand Slam. Patrick McEnroe, who coached the Empire and McHale, calls her "a grinder." "She's right there. I've always been impressed with her work ethic," said McEnroe, who previously helped McHale while leading the USTA player developmental program. "From the first time I saw her, she's really been committed to putting in the work to be the best she can be." — AP

SOUTH AFRICA HOLD ACES DESPITE COLLAPSE

CENTURION: South Africa held on to a strong position despite a top-order batting collapse in their second innings on the third day of the second Test against New Zealand yesterday. South Africa were 105 for six at the close, an overall lead of 372 runs on a pitch at Centurion's SuperSport Park offering assistance to bowlers, with swing, seam and uneven bounce.

New Zealand hit back after conceding a first innings lead of 267, with Tim Southee and Trent Boult taking two wickets each to reduce South Africa to 47 for four. Doug Bracewell and Neil Wagner also picked up wickets, with only Quinton de Kock shining for the South Africans, with his second half-century of the match.

South Africa's three-pronged pace attack was mainly responsible for New Zealand being bowled out for 214 in their first innings. Dale Steyn and Kagiso Rabada took three wickets each and Vernon Philander claimed two.

LAST MAN

Only captain Kane Williamson was able to provide sustained resistance for New Zealand. He was last man out for 77. While his teammates struggled, Williamson remained calm and well-organised, seemingly with time to spare as he combatted the pace threat. He batted for 286 minutes and faced 133 balls in an innings which included eight fours and a six.

With star bowlers Steyn and Philander both returning from long-term injuries, it was the first time they had played in the same Test match as Rabada, South Africa?s 21-year-old cricketer of the year. The combination proved relentless, although it took South Africa more than an hour to take the first wicket of the day, when Rabada trapped Henry Nicholls leg before wicket for 36.

Williamson and Nicholls put on 60 for the fourth wicket and enabled New Zealand to make an encouraging start to the day after resuming at 38 for three. New Zealand's resistance crumbled after the breakthrough, although South Africa lost control briefly when Rabada and Steyn peppered number ten batsman Neil

Captain Faf du Plessis and De Kock tried to rebuild the innings but first innings centurion Du Plessis made only six before he was caught at first slip off Boult.

De Kock seemed untroubled by the struggles of his team-mates, going to his second half-century of the match off 42 balls, with eight fours and a six. But one ball later he received a vicious bouncer from Doug Bracewell which he gloved to gully. — AFP

OLYMPIC CHAMPION PUIG SETS SIGHTS ON GRAND SLAM VICTORY

NEW YORK: Put the rubbish out, get the shopping done, win an Olympic gold medal. That was the to-do list of Monica Puig, the 22-year-old whose victory in the women's singles in Rio earlier this month made her the first ever Puerto Rican to win Olympic gold.

It was an unlikely but fully-deserved win for the world number 34, catapulting her to hero status and making her a role model for young people in the island Commonwealth that is enduring tough economic times.

Now Puig wants to capitalise on her victory, both on and off the court.

"I know that there's no doubt in my mind that I can probably win a grand slam because the Olympics was one," she told Reuters at Flushing Meadows on Sunday, on

the eve of the US Open. "It just doesn't have the title grand slam but the best players in the world were there, including Serena (Williams).

"I won the biggest thing on my to-do list and I just want to keep knocking off other ones, and that would be to win a grand slam." Confident but at-ease despite all the new-found attention, Puig is still coming to terms with her stunning victory in Rio.

"I don't think it's really sunk in," she said. "It's a little bit difficult to process. I was by no means the favourite. It was such a surreal ride." In floods of tears during the medal ceremony, Puig and her gold medal have been virtually inseparable ever since.

"I remember waking up several times in the middle of the night and just looking at my night stand to actually see if my medal was there because I didn't believe it," she said. "I wasn't able to sleep very much for three, four or five days. It was the most surreal feeling in the world to be an Olympic champion that morning."

Along with congratulations from her fellow players, Puig has been subjected to abuse on social media, with many people expecting a let-down at the US Open, where she faces Saisai Zheng of China in the first round. "Unfortunately I'm guilty of reading my Twitter and sometimes the comments under articles but you know what, a lot of that fuels my fire," she said. Puig, who was greeted by thousands of people when she landed in Puerto Rico after her victory, embraces being a role model ."I see it as a responsibility," she said.

"I know what comes with that responsibility as far as conducting myself in the same way that I have, in a very respectful manner, always setting a good example, especially for the youth of Puerto Rico, which is very important.

"I gave me a lot of hope back to the people of Puerto Rico, which was really important for me because they're going through such difficult times.

"The message is that nothing is ever impossible. People probably thought me winning a medal was impossible and I proved them wrong."

Not surprisingly, Puig says she will have a special role in the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo. "They have approached me to be flagbearer," she said. "They've already asked me

about the possibility of doing it in 2020 and

MADRID CITY DEMANDS 18.4M EUROS FROM REAL

MADRID: The Madrid city government said Monday it will pursue Real Madrid for 18.4 million euros (\$20.6 million) in illegal state aid that the European Commission ordered the club to repay.

Real, Spanish champions Barcelona and other clubs were found to have received an "unfair advantage" by the commission in July due to tax breaks and overpriced land deals. "The city hall will establish the measures necessary to carry out the decision of the European Commission to recover the aid of 18.4 million euros granted to Real Madrid," the local government said in a statement.

"At the start of September a twomonth period given by Brussels to the city hall to present to the commission the total amount (total owed plus interest) to be recouped, a description of the measures adopted and the documents that show the club has been ordered to reimburse the aid will expire." The club agreed to sell a plot of land to Madrid's government in 1998, a transaction that eventually was not completed. As compensation for failure to complete the deal, Real received 22.7 million euros from the state in 2011.

The value of the land at the time of the initial agreement in 1998 was just 595,000 euros. The commission's investigation showed that Real Madrid were entitled to compensation of just 4.3 million euros, therefore obtaining an advantage of 18.4 million. The club have already signalled their intention to appeal the Commission's ruling to the European Court of Justice. — AFP

MANCHESTER: Wayne Rooney's midfield experiment with England is over, with the Manchester United captain set to revert to playing as a deeplying forward for the national team under new coach Sam Allardyce.

Rooney finished last season playing as a central midfielder for United under Louis van Gaal, and played there for England during its European Championship campaign that ended with an embarrassing last-16 loss to Iceland.

New United manager Jose Mourinho has returned Rooney to the No. 10 role behind the striker, and Allardyce also thinks that's his best position. "Wayne's position has changed at Manchester United," Allardyce said on Monday, "and that's the sort of position I'd be looking for him to be playing in."

The player most affected by that positional tweak is Ross Barkley, who was dropped on Sunday by Allardyce in his first squad announcement since replacing Roy Hodgson as England coach. Barkley plays in the same position as Rooney at Everton, and has started the season in good form for his club with two goals in four games. With Dele Alli no room for another attacking playmaker.

"We have had to make some very difficult decisions, none more so than obviously I would think Ross Barkley," Allardyce said. "But you have to make these decisions. The door will always be open for Ross, but at this moment I felt the squad I picked is the right one."

Looking to put his own stamp on the national team. Allardyce has recalled winger Theo Walcott and also picked an uncapped wide player in Michail Antonio of West Ham. It would suggest Allardyce is looking to play with more width than England did under Hodgson.

Antonio's rise to the national team is being compared to that of Leicester striker Jamie Vardy, in that he started out in non-league football - with Tooting and Mitcham, a club in south London rather than in an academy of a big club. He had spells on loan at lowly clubs before joining Sheffield Wednesday and then Nottingham Forest. Antonio moved to West Ham last year and has impressed as a right-sided midfielder, especially in the air. He has scored eight headed goals since the

start of last season - including one in each of his last two league games.

"His journey is something that deserves to be in this squad and me to have a look at as a potential player going forward," Allardyce said. "It's a bit similar to Jamie Vardy - it shows if you have got guts and determination and desire, how much it means. 'He goes forward, creates a career for himself and finally ends up in the Premier League and with us in this squad. I'm looking forward to meeting him."

Marcus Rashford wasn't included by Allardyce, despite going on as a substitute to score United's injury-time winner against Hull in the Premier League on Saturday in his first appearance of the season. Zlatan Ibrahimovic has displaced 18-yearold Rashford up front at United. Rashford will instead play for England Under-21s this week to get some game time.

"Having international experience with the under-21s will be invaluable for us later down the line," Allardyce said. "If he plays for Manchester United on a regular basis, he would certainly - if he is breaking into the Manchester United team - be in my squad. — AP

BUENOS AIRES: Diego Maradona was not able to leave Argentina on the weekend because his passport had been reported "stolen", preventing him from travelling to Dubai, according to his lawyer. "It's a very rare occurence," said Diego Morla, the double World Cup winner's lawyer, Diego Morla. "They told him his passport had been reported as stolen despite Diego holding it in his hands!" Morla hinted that there must have have been a fake report which triggered the situation. "Diego is really surprised by this saga, which has strangely happened right after he criticised the government," said Morla. The former Napoli and Argentina legend last month condemned the new Argentinian government saying that since they had come to power Argentina had fallen to its "knees".

Kagawa to heal old wounds in UAE rematch

DUBAI: Japan midfielder Shinji Kagawa is still haunted by his penalty shootout miss in the loss to the United Arab Emirates at last year's Asian Cup and is eyeing revenge when the teams meet again in a 2018 World Cup qualifier on Thursday. Kagawa was in tears after his spot kick hit the post in Sydney as UAE claimed a 5-4 triumph on penalties following a 1-1 draw to end Japan's title defence and set up a semi-final showdown against hosts Australia. "The (UAE) team was different then and so was our coach, the players and the situation but I can still see the torment in my mind," the Dortmund player was quoted as saying by Kyodo news agency ahead of the Asian World Cup qualifier in Saitama. "That was then but this is now and we just have to prepare well to beat them this time." "I'm not sure who is in their team this time and we will have to have a look at some video footage but they have some good players and our coach will have to have a look at how we will take them on over the next few days." After the UAE match, Japan travel to Bangkok to take on Thailand in their next Group B match five days later and Kagawa believes the four-time Asian champions need to be wary of their improving opponents.

Chadli joins West Brom on four-year deal

TOTTENHAM: Forward Nacer Chadli has joined West Bromwich Albion from Premier League rivals Tottenham Hotspur on a four-year contract, both clubs announced yesterday. The 27-year-old becomes Albion's second permanent signing of the transfer window, with manager Tony Pulis having set his sight on bringing in five new players before Wednesday's transfer deadline. Though no financial details were disclosed, media reports said Albion had paid 13 million pounds (\$17.01 million) for Chadli. "I feel very good to be here. It came very quickly but I spoke to the club and they have a good team, a good manager," Chadli told the club's website (www.wba.co.uk). ENGLAND'S MANAGER DEFENDS DECISION TO OMIT BARKLEY

LONDON: England manager Sam Allardyce has defended the decision to leave Everton midfielder Ross Barkley out of his first squad for the 2018 World Cup qualifier in Slovakia at the weekend. The 22-year-old has enjoyed an impressive start to the Premier League season and many observers felt he had done enough to deserve a place in the 23-man group named on Sunday.

However, Allardyce, who succeeded Roy Hodgson as manager after England's underwhelming Euro 2016 campaign, said there was still time for Barkley to feature in his future plans. "We have had to make a few difficult decisions and none more so than Ross Barkley," Allardyce told reporters on Monday. "For him it's disappointing, for me, you have to make these decisions. The door will always be open for Ross but right now I feel the squad I've picked is the right one." Marcus Rashford also missed out, instead selected for the under-21 squad against Norway, even though the 18-year-old striker featured for England at Euro 2016 and scored Manchester United's injury-time winner against Hull City on Saturday. "Having international experience in the under-21s will prove invaluable for us further down the line," the former West Ham, Bolton Wanderers and Sunderland manager added. "If he plays for Manchester United on a regular basis, if he is regularly breaking into the United team then it will be a good basis for inclusion in my squad."

Allardyce, 61, will take his first training session with the players later on Monday with several, most notably Manchester City's goalkeeper Joe Hart, involved in speculation over their club futures ahead of Wednesday's transfer deadline day. "If Joe arrives today, and I'm sure if there's anything in the pipeline Joe will tell us this may happen. Then we can get ready if it does," Allardyce said.

Slovakia held England to a goalless draw in their last meeting little at Euro 2016, a game Allardyce expects will have little bearing on Sunday's meeting in Trnava. "The tactics will be different when we play them in Slovakia. That team will have to come out to attack us, they're playing at home, whereas in the Euros, we knew that one point was enough for them. — Reuters ranked team(39th).

RAKITIC HEADER EARNS BARCA VICTORY IN BILBAO

BARCELONA: Champions Barcelona came through a gruelling La Liga test at a rainswept San Mames on Sunday, beating Athletic Bilbao 1-0 thanks to Ivan Rakitic's first-half header.

Elsewhere, Las Palmas thrashed Granada 5-1 to top the table with six points from two matches ahead of Barca and Real Madrid on goal difference while Europa League holders Sevilla were held to a goalless draw at Villarreal.

Croatia midfielder Rakitic glanced in Arda Turan's cross to complete a sweeping move started by Luis Suarez and settle the visiting side's nerves after a few early scares, including goalkeeper Marc-Andre ter Stegen giving the ball away in his own area. Barca grew in confidence after the break and stand-in captain Lionel Messi spurned two chances while Suarez also failed to capitalise on a couple of clear opportunities and had a shot cleared off the line in injury time. Luis Enrique's men almost lived to regret their profligacy as Bilbao's Raul Garcia fired narrowly wide and Iker Muniain had a late penalty appeal turned down.

"I'm happy with the result against an

opponent of such magnitude," Luis Enrique told a news conference. "We could have wrapped the game up earlier but it was a good performance and the three points are well earned." Luis Enrique had warned that the visit to

San Mames was always one of the hardest away trips for Barca and although they looked comfortable at the start, they soon began to struggle with Bilbao's intense pressing and aggression.

Ter Stegen gave the visitors a fright when he played the ball straight to Benat Etxebarria but the keeper got his body in the way of the midfielder's shot and later made saves from Aritz Aduriz and Benat again.

RISKY STYLE

Jordi Alba defended the German's risky style, saying: "I wish all goalkeepers were like him, he's the best in the world with the ball at his feet, he's our goalkeeper for the present and will be for many years to come". Barca jitters were calmed in the 21st minute when Rakitic was left unmarked in the area to nod Turan's centre into the corner. Turkey international Turan spurned a chance to double the lead before the break, miskicking at the near post, the first of a series of opportunities that went begging for the champions.

Messi started to make an impact in the second half after a relatively quiet first period but twice missed the target.

The usually prolific Suarez also endured

a frustrating evening in front of goal, inexplicably failing to convert the simplest of chances at the end, taking too long to shoot with the net gaping and seeing his shot scrambled off the line.

Las Palmas followed their 4-2 win at Valencia last week with a dominant display against Granada, Nabil El Zhar scoring twice in the 5-1 rout.

Midfielder Kevin-Prince Boateng netted for the second game running after joining Las Palmas from AC Milan and dedicated his goal to the victims of last week's earthquake in Italy that has killed at least 290 people.

"I leapt off my seat at the goal because of the quality of the counter attack, the shot and because...he hit it with his heart,"

said coach Quique Setien. In Sunday's other game, Alaves drew 0-0 at home to Sporting Gijon. — Reuters

BEAT PSG IN FRENCH LEAGUE MONACO

PARIS: Monaco beat defending champion Paris Saint-Germain 3-1 on Sunday to move level on points with Guingamp and Nice at the top of the French league.

Portugal midfielder Joao Moutinho and Brazilian defender Fabinho scored in the first half. Uruguay striker Edinson Cavani pulled a goal back midway through the second half before an own goal from PSG right back Serge Aurier sealed the points for Monaco. All three have seven points, one more than Lyon and PSG. Moutinho, who played in Portugal's European Championship final win against France last month, struck in the 13th minute.

Center half Andrea Raggi's pass freed full back Djibril Sidibe down the right and his cross fell kindly to Moutinho, who ran onto it and hit a firm shot past goalkeeper Kevin Trapp from just inside the penalty area.

Monaco doubled its lead on the stroke of halftime when Brazilian defender Fabinho scored from the penalty spot after countryman David Luiz had fouled another Brazilian, Jemerson, following Moutinho's

Fabinho, who has scored all four penalties he has taken this season - including two in the Champions League qualifying win against Spanish side Villarreal - coolly sent Trapp the wrong way from the spot.

Shortly after PSG left back Layvin Kurzawa missed a good chance against his old club, Cavani pounced in the 63rd when he headed in Aurier's cross.

But Aurier then turned Sidibe's cross into his own net with 10 minutes left. Monaco was also the last team to beat PSG prior to this game, when it won 2-0 in Paris on March 20. Earlier, Uruguay striker Diego Rolan scored the winning goal as Bordeaux beat Nantes 1-0. Former France winger Jeremy Menez, who joined Bordeaux from AC Milan this season, beat defender Diego

Carlos and his cross found Rolan at the back post. The 23-year-old Rolan, who netted 15 league goals for Bordeaux two seasons ago, managed only seven last term but has scored two in three games so far.The win moved Bordeaux up to seventh place, one above Toulouse, which beat Bordeaux 4 1 last weekend but could only draw 0-0 away to Saint-Etienne in Sunday's other game. — AP

FED HIKE LOOKS CERTAIN AS CONSUMER SPENDING UP

Core PCE price index ticks up 0.1%

WASHINGTON: US consumer spending increased for a fourth straight month in July amid strong demand for automobiles, pointing to a pickup in economic growth that could pave the way for the Federal Reserve to raise interest rates this year. Yesterday's report from the Commerce Department came several days after Fed Chair Janet Yellen said the case for raising rates had strengthened in recent months. Low inflation, however, suggests the US central bank could wait until its December policy meeting

before raising borrowing costs.

"This report is a mixed bag for the Fed. While the consumer sector is continuing to advance solidly, progress towards the Fed's inflation mandate has stalled," said Michelle Girard, chief economist at RBS in Stamford, Connecticut. "It strengthens the case for an increase in interest rates, but does not suggest an urgency for policymakers to act in September."

The Commerce Department said that consumer spending, which accounts for more than two-thirds of US economic activity, rose 0.3 percent last month after a 0.5 percent gain in June. July's increase was in line with economists' expectations. When adjusted for inflation, consumer spending also rose 0.3 percent in July

after advancing 0.4 percent in June.

That suggests consumer spending retained much of its momentum from the second quarter, when it grew at a 4.4 percent annual rate, the fastest pace in nearly two years. The jump helped to mitigate some of the impact of a sharp inventory drop and prolonged business investment downturn.

The economy grew at a lackluster 1.1 percent annual rate in the second quarter. July's upbeat consumer spending data lifted the dollar against a basket of currencies. Wall Street rose, boosted by gains in financial

stocks. US Treasuries were trading higher.

Yellen told a gathering of global central bankers last week that "solid performance of the labor market and our outlook for economic activity and inflation" had bolstered the argument for raising interest rates in recent months. The Fed hiked interest rates at the end of last year for the first time in nearly a decade, but has held them steady this year amid concerns over persistently low inflation.

TAME INFLATION

Financial markets are currently pricing in a 30 percent chance of a rate increase at the Fed's Sept. 20-21 policy meeting and a 57.2 percent probability at the December meeting, according to CME Group's FedWatch tool. Last month's consumer spending report added to data on the goods trade deficit, industrial production, durable goods orders and residential construc-

tion that have pointed to an acceleration in economic growth early in the third quarter.

The Atlanta Fed is currently estimating the economy to grow at an annual pace of 3.5 percent in the third quarter. Consumer spending is being driven by a tightening labor market, which is steadily lifting wages. Rising home values and stock prices, which are boosting household wealth, are also supporting consumption.

Last month, there was little sign of inflation even as consumer spending firmed. The personal consumption expenditures (PCE) price index, excluding the volatile food and energy components, edged up 0.1 percent after a similar gain in lune.

In the 12 months through July the core PCE increased 1.6 percent. It has risen by the same margin every month since March. The core PCE is the Fed's preferred inflation measure and is running below its 2 percent target.

"We remain of the view that services inflation will continue to be firm, but some of its strength will likely be offset by the other components of the PCE basket, leading overall inflation to increase at a moderate pace," said Blerina Uruci, an economist at Barclays in Washington.

Consumer spending last month was lifted by a 1.6 percent surge in purchases of long-lasting manufactured goods such as automobiles. Spending on services rose 0.4 percent, but outlays on non-durable goods slipped 0.5 percent.

Personal income increased 0.4 percent in July after rising 0.3 percent in June. Wages and salaries advanced 0.5 percent. Savings rose to \$794.7 billion from \$776.2 billion in June. "We would look at today's higher savings ... as creating room for spending to run a bit hotter than income in future months," said Andrew Hollenhorst, an economist at Citigroup in New York.—Reuters

QATAR OUTPERFORMS

MIDEAST STOCK MARKETS

DUBAI: Qatar's stock market outperformed the Gulf yesterday as large-caps carried the index higher, but other bourses were little changed as a fresh slide in oil prices and a retreat in Asian share markets kept buyers

Qatar's main index added 0.6 percent, taking its gains over the past month to 5.4 percent. Qatar National Bank rose 1.0 percent and petrochemical producer Industries Qatar climbed 2.5 percent.

Both stocks are on a provisional list of about 20 which index compiler FTSE has said may be included in its secondary emerging markets index. A final list of stocks to be included will be announced after the close on Wednesday. Dubai's index edged up 0.1 percent. Courier Aramex climbed 2.3 percent to 4.09 dirhams in a second straight day of unusually heavy trade; it has jumped 7.5 percent over the past week, and is now trading close to the median fair value of 4.02 dirhams estimated by six analysts polled by Reuters.

Other mid-cap shares also outperformed, with Dubai Parks and Resorts rising 1.9 percent and Gulf Navigation Holding adding 2.7 percent. In Abu Dhabi, the index edged down 0.1 percent, with the main drag from large-cap lenders. First Gulf Bank fell 0.4 percent and Abu Dhabi Commercial Bank slid 0.2 percent. Saudi Arabia's index ended flat at 6,071 points as petrochemi-

cals and banks were mixed. Saudi International Petrochemical (Sipchem) jumped 5.5 percent but Advanced Petrochemical fell 0.8 percent.

Islamic lender Al Rajhi Bank rose 1.4 percent while Samba Financial Group and National Commercial Bank each lost 0.6 percent. Saudi Telecom Co (STC) retreated 1.3 percent. An Egyptian official said representatives from Saudi Telecom were in Egypt this week to discuss the possibility of obtaining a fourth-generation mobile phone licence there.

The Egyptian index edged down 0.3 percent as stocks favored by foreign funds retreated. Commercial International Bank lost 1.6 percent and Talaat Mostafa Group Holding dropped 2.1 percent. Cleopatra Hospital rose 0.5 percent to 9.25 Egyptian pounds after it reported a second-quarter net profit of 6.6 million Egyptian pounds (\$743,000), a 55 percent year-on-year decline.

Analysts at Pharos Research said the main reason for the drop was 6 million pounds in provisions for doubtful receivables, while revenue was pressured by reduced contributions from outpatient clinics and laboratories.

Pharos has a "hold" rating on the stock with a target price of 10.95 pounds. Earlier this month, Renaissance Capital put a "buy" rating on the stock with a target of 11.95 pounds; in July, EFG Hermes rated it a "buy" with a target of 11.70 pounds.

EGYPT APPROVES VAT AT 13%

CAIRO: Egypt's parliament approved yesterday a long-awaited law introducing a value-added tax of 13 percent, rising to 14 percent in the next fiscal year, a key part of the government's plan to reform the economy and cut its deficit. Parliament had been debating the law for weeks, with dozens of lawmakers opposing the government's initial proposal of 14 percent, for fear of stoking inflation in a country where tens of millions live one pay check away from hunger. The house budget committee had pushed to reduce the rate to 12 percent.

percent.

The deadlock was broken on Sunday when Finance Minister Amr El Garhy proposed a compromise of 13 percent for the 2016-17 fiscal year. "The law was passed and got final approval. It will be 13 percent for this year, and at the start of the next financial year will be 14 percent," Yasser Omar, an MP on the house budget committee, told

"It's a tax reform that Egypt needed

to begin its economic reform process. This is the start of an economic reform program that will see Egypt have a stronger tax regime that will make the economic system stronger, and will allow it to draw foreign investment."

The VAT law is part of a reform program that formed the basis of a \$12 billion, three-year loan agreed with the International Monetary Fund earlier this month. The IMF deal has yet to be approved by its executive board, but the IMF mission chief for Egypt, Chris Jarvis, has told Reuters previously that disbursement of the first instalment was not contingent on passage of the VAT law.

Egypt also agreed a \$3 billion, threeyear loan program with the World Bank in December, but the first tranche has been delayed pending parliamentary approval of measures including VAT. Economists welcomed the news, which they said showed the government continue with politically sensitive reforms that could spark unrest in a country that has seen street protests unseat two presidents since 2011. "It's positive for revenue generation and the budget deficit. This shows government commitment to reforms," said Reham ElDesoki, senior economist at Arqaam Capital.

"They are going ahead with one of the difficult reforms that has been pending for a decade and should be followed by the other reforms, such as a devaluation and other fiscal reforms."

VAT will replace the current sales tax, which economists say creates market distortions. It is expected to broaden the tax base in a country where the government struggles to collect income tax because of a large informal economy and widespread avoidance.

The VAT law exempts basic goods and services to protect the poor. Egypt's economy has been struggling since an uprising in 2011 ushered in political instability that drove away tourists and foreign investors, major earners of foreign currency. —Reuters

KUWAIT REAL ESTATE ACTIVITY SOFTENS; JULY SALES LOWEST

NBK ECONOMIC REPORT

KUWAIT: Midway through the summer season, real estate activity appeared to have softened further, with July sales the lowest in four years. Overall sales across all sectors totaled KD 1.45 billion year-to-date (ytd), down 25 percent from the same period last year. Sales in the residential and investment sector are down about one third ytd from last year, while commercial activity is up for the year. July's price performance, as reflected in NBK's real estate price indices, continued to reflect an ongoing gradual correction that started in 2015, after a 5-year stellar performance.

Seasonality continues to weigh on residential sales. The sector registered 196 transactions, down 26 percent for the month, while KD sales dropped to KD 62.9 million, down by 29 percent month-on-month (m/m) (Chart 2). The residential sector continues to lag last year's transactions and KD sales by 22 percent and 34 percent, respectively. April and July of this year appear to be the weakest months in five years in terms of KD sales and number of transactions.

Residential real estate prices cooled further this month. The NBK residential home price index registered 163.6 points in July, staying relatively flat on the month but retreating by 10.9 percent y/y. The NBK residential home price index has been trending downward since the beginning of 2015, when it peaked at 186 points in January 2015. Similarly, the NBK residential land price index retreated in July; at 183.6 points, the index slid by 5.4 percent y/y, but improved slightly on the month. Land prices were the first to correct, back in 2015, and have shown some signs of stabilizing recent-

ly. Apartment sales continue to carry the investment sector during the current environment. Smaller single apartments (for investment) represented 64 percent of total transactions. Total sales for the sector totaled KD 61 million, half the sales recorded in July of last year. The sector registered 86 transactions, the lowest on record for the month of July in ten years. The NBK investment-building price index retreated to 4Q14 levels, erasing earlier year-to-date gains. After making slight price gains since the beginning of the year, the

index stood at 192 points in July, slipping below the 200 mark for the first time since October 2014, and down 15.8 percent y/y. The investment building price index average for the year stood at 208.9 points, supported by solid numbers from January through April. Commercial sector sales cooled down in July following an almost yearlong rally. Sales for the month totaled KD 20.4 million, down 34.7 percent y/y. This was on only five transactions; the largest transaction recorded was a commercial building in Hawally for KD 6 million.

DOLLAR JUMPS, BONDS AND STOCKS SELL OFF ON FED

LONDON: The dollar rose to a three-week high against the yen yesterday, while bond yields surged to their highest since June and stocks sold off after senior Federal Reserve officials indicated a US interest rate increase was on the cards soon.

In the past few months, the Fed has been swaying back and forth on whether to raise rates this year, keeping investors across the globe on tenterhooks. But on Friday, at an annual gathering of global central bankers in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, Fed Chair Janet Yellen gave one of the clearest indications that a rate hike was probably round the corner. She said the case for an inter-

est rate hike has strengthened in recent months as the US labor market and economy improved. That echoed what other senior Fed officials had been saying in the run-up to the Jackson Hole symposium. And while she gave no hints on the timing of a hike, Fed Vice Chair Stanley Fischer said Yellen's speech was consistent with expectations for possible rate increases this year. Fischer said Friday's nonfarm payrolls report for August was likely to be key to the decision over a hike in the near term. "Fischer confirmed the broad view on the Fed Open Market Committee that the economy has strengthened of late and that interest rates should be raised gradually; possibly again next month if this week's employment report supports a rate rise," said Stewart Richardson, chief investment officer at RMG Wealth Management. The odds of a hike in September rose to 33 percent following the comments, from 21 percent on Thursday, according to CME Group's FedWatch tool.

The prospects of higher US interest rates saw European shares lose ground. Germany's DAX was 0.7 percent lower, while the blue-chip Euro Stoxx 50 was down 0.4 percent. British markets are closed for a holiday. And after closing lower on Friday, Wall Street stock futures pointed to a flat start yesterday.

YIELDS JUMP

Earlier, Japan's Nikkei bucked the trend in Asia, closing 2.3 percent higher, the biggest one-day gain in three weeks, as the yen weakened against the resurgent dollar. The dollar rose 0.5 percent to a three-week high of 102.39 yen. That followed gains of 1.3 percent on Friday, its biggest one-day advance in almost seven weeks. The dollar index was up at 95.769 its highest in two

Japan's benchmark Nikkei 225 added 2.3 percent to close at 16,737.49. Japanese stocks generally gain on a weak yen because the earnings of the nation's giant exporters are boosted. South Korea's Kospi fell 0.3 percent to 2,032.35. Hong Kong's Hang Seng slipped 0.4 percent to 22,821.74, while the Shanghai Composite inched down 0.01 percent to 3,070.03.

Treasury yields rose to their highest

level since June 24, when the result of Britain's EU referendum sent shockwaves through markets. "We're still cautious about the scope for a September rate hike, but it is increasingly becoming a close call," said Martin van Vliet, senior rates strategist at ING. Investors will turn their focus to a slew of US data this week before the all-important jobs report on Friday. Among the releases to be scrutinized will be US consumer confidence for August, due on Tuesday, while productivity, manufacturing and construction figures are due on Thursday.

Global factory activity surveys will also be released on Thursday. In commodities, crude prices fell on the back of a rally in the dollar and concerns about growing output after exports from Iraq in August exceeded July levels. Iran also said late last week that it would only cooperate in upcoming pro-

KUWAIT REAL ESTATE PRICES FLUCTUATE

KFH Real Estate Report

KUWAIT: Price indicators fluctuated based on various factors related to real estate types. Also, real estate prices have fluctuated in various Kuwait governorates. Residential land price indices decreased in capital governorate by 2.2 percent during Q2 2016 compared to Q1 where average price per meter declined in capital governorate for the second quarter receptivity to less than KD 1000 / sm. Average price/ sm2 reached KD 961 in Q2 compared to KD 983 in Q1 due to the continued decline in prices in most of the governorate areas. Prices declined in the highest price areas in the governorate (Shuwaikh Residential Area) by 2 percent. Prices declines in Abdullah Al-Salem district slightly (0.3 percent) compared to Q1. This area is considered as the second highest price area in the governorate.

Shamiya area did not witness any change compared to average price in Q1. Also, Nuzha and Edailiya areas did not witness any change in Q2. Faihaa areas witnessed a decline in prices by 2.5 percent while Qadisiya area recorded a decline by less percentage. Meanwhile average prices stabilized in Kaifan area during Q2.

In regard to areas where average price/ sm is less ie Mansouriya and Rawda, prices have decline by 0.7 percent and 1.6 percent respectively. Decline in prices was more than that in Yarmouk and Surra areas thus recording 2.1 percent and 3.2 percent. Average price declined in Da'eya area by 6.2 percent while it declined by 7.4 percent in Dasmah area.

Low price areas in the governorate recorded the highest decline ratios during Q2 in Q2 compared to Q1 e.g. Gharnata area in which prices declined by 8.8 percent while in Doha they declined by 8.4 percent compared to Q1.

Prices declined in Hawally governorate which recorded the highest decline ratios among all governorates in regard to average price/ M2 of private residence in Q2, thus reaching the KD 900 / M2 for the first time in 2 years. Prices declined by 4.4 percent compared to Q1 thus recording KD 874 / M2 in Q2. Accordingly, decline percentage in the governorate reached 11.5 percent on annual basis compared to the same period last year.

Price per square meter declined in all governorate areas during Q2. Prices declined in the highest price areas of the governorate e.g. Bedaa area by 3.7 percent and by higher percentage 5 percent in Shaab area. Decline ratio reached 5.8 percent in West Mishrif area which is considered as the third highest price area followed by Siddique area which as witnessed a decline by 3.7 percent.

Average value areas e.g. Salam and Hitteen areas which have witnessed a decline by 3.7 percent compared to Q1. Based on this ratio, average prices in nearby areas e.g. Shuhadaa and Zahraa areas have declined. Prices declined in Bayan Area by more than 6 percent and more than that in Jabriya area which has recorded 26.2 percent. Prices declined in low price areas in the governorate i.e. Rumaithiyaa and Mishrif by 4.7 percent and 4.4 percent respectively. Meanwhile prices declined in the lowest price areas i.e. Salwa by 3 percent compared to Q1 last year.

Prices declined in Farwaniya area which is considered as the second highest decline area among governorate areas as it recorded a decline by 4.2 percent after Hawally governorate. Average price/ M2 recorded was KD 572 in Q2 this year. Price per square meter declined also by 10.5 percent compared to Q2 last year.

Price levels declined in governorate areas during Q2/ Price per square meter declined significantly in Ishbilia area by ' percent bearing in mind that this area is considered as one of the highest priced areas in the governorate. Average prices in Rihab area witnessed a decline by 3 percent followed by Farwaniya area by 2 percent and Khaitan area by 1 percent. Decline in price per square meter in average price areas recorded a decline less than the decline recorded in high price areas e.g. Jaleeb Al-Shoyoukh area and Rabiya in which prices declined by 3 percent and 5 percent respectively. Prices declined in Fardoas area by 5 percent while in Andalus prices declined by 6 percent.

Prices decline

Prices declined in low price areas e.g. Omariya and Ardiya by 2 percent and 1 percent respectively. Meanwhile prices declined at higher rate by 6 percent in the lowest price areas i.e. Sabah Al-Naser area.

Prices declined in Ahmadi governorate in Q2 by 2.7 percent compared to Q1. Price per square meter reached KD 505 in Q2 at the governorate level. Price per square meter declined on annual basis by 10.9 percent compared to Q2 last year. Concerning price movements in governorates, prices declined in most areas except stable price areas. Prices stabilized in the southern marine coast strip area and main coast strip area in Q2. Agaila area comes next as the second highest value area per square meter thus recording a stability in price per square meter followed by Mangaf area in which prices have declined by 7.2 percent compared to Q1.

Prices declines in Dhaher area by 3.3 percent and declined at a higher rate 4.4 percent in Jaber Al-Ali area. Prices declined in Fintas area by 3.3 percent. Prices stabilized in Sabahiya, Khiran Pearl areas. Meanwhile, prices declined in Wafra area by 4.4 percent and declined in Sabah Al-Ahmad Marine area by 1 percent in O2

area by 1 percent in Q2.

Prices declined in Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate thus recording KD 613 in Q2 ie a decline ratio by 1.5 percent compared to Q1. Decline ratio has reached 9.1 percent in Q2 this year compared to the same period last year. Concerning price levels at governorates in Q2 prices have declined in the highest price areas in the governorate i.e.

coastal strip area (B) by 2.1 percent. Prices declined in Sabah Al-Salem area by 7.6 percent and declined in Masayel; area by less than 1 percent compared to Q1 this year.

In average price areas e.g. Addan area, prices declined by 1.4 percent while prices declined at a higher rate in other areas e/g/Qurain, Qosour and Mubarak Al-Kabeer by 4 percent. Funaitees and Abu-Fatira areas were the only exception at the govenroate level where prices increased by 7.8 percent in Funaitees and 8.2 percent in Abu-Fatira area.

Prices declined in Jahra governorate by 4.2 percent thus recording KD 462 / M2 in Q2. This decline ratio is less when compared to Q1 decline ratio by 4.4 percent. On annual basis price levels declined in Q2 this year by 12.6 percent compared to the same period last year. This decline ratio is considered as the highest decline ratio among governorates in regard to private residence prices levels.

highest price area. Prices declined in certain places of Fahad Al-Salem St. - Qibla area. Average price per square meter declined in Ahmed Al-Jaber Street - Sharq area while prices witnessed the highest decline among commercial area at the governorate as the decline reached 4.9 percent in Mubarakiya area. Prices stabilized in certain areas of Ali Al-Salem Street and Gharabally square compared to Q1 this year.

Prices declined in Hawally area by 2.5 percent during Q2. Price per square meter reached KD 3,332 compared to KD 3,418 in Q1. Price per square meter declined also on annual basis among governorates by 7 percent compared to price levels witnessed in Q2 last year. Average prices per square meter stabilized for the second quarter respectively in areas overlooking 6th ring road at Dhajeej area. Prices declined by 4.5 percent in Dhajeej area - southern Khaitan and declined in internal areas of Ardiya area by 2 percent compared to Q1 this year.

Prices stabilized in Shuaiba and Mina Abdullah areas in Q2 compared to Q1 this year. This stability comes on the back of the stability witnessed in the highest price areas e.g. Fanar Jewel as well as other internal and main places in the area. Prices stabilized also in Mina Abdullah for the fourth time respectively e.g. gravel warehouses and other internal places.

Prices of farms and livestock farms

Prices of livestock farms and stables in Kuwait stabilized during Q2 compared to Q1 this year compared to the decline by 3 percent in Q1. On annual basis, prices declined significantly compared to Q2 last year by 12 percent. Quarter 2 witnessed stability in prices in most of the governorate areas e.g. usufruct areas e.g. Kbad Livestock Farms covering an area of 2500 M2 at Ahmadi governorate. Prices reached KD 62.5 Thousand in Q2. Prices stabilized also in camel farms compared to Q1 and stabilized also in usufruct land prices declined to reach KD 51.2 Thousand in Wafra Livestock Farms. Prices stabilized in Equestrian stables at Ahmadi Governorate during Q2 compared to Q1. This stability comes on the back of the stability witnessed in prices of equestrian stables area, racecourse area, golf field and internal areas. Prices in Agricultural land of Jahra and Ahmadi governorates did not witness any change during Q2 compared to Q1 prices. This stability comes on the back of the stability in average price in most of the governorate areas. Average price reached KD 3.3 in Wafra Agricultural Area - Ahmadi governorate. Prices stabilized also in Wafra area covering an area of 50 thousand and 100 thousand for the third time respectively.

Average price per square meter in agricultural land reached KD 3.6 in Jahra governorate. Prices in the governorate did not witness any change compared to Q1 due to the stability in prices in Abdali area covering 50000 M2 and in Abdali area - Mutlaa Street covering any area of 100000 M2. Prices stabilized also in livestock farms at Sulaibiya covering an area of 1 Million square meters and an area of 50000sm.

Q2 this year has coincided with the beginning of summer season. Accordingly, demand on such real estates shall increase. Average prices declined in Q2 compared to Q1. This can be attributed to the fact that the end of Q2 has coincided with the wholly month of Ramadan. Prices declined in Ahmadi governorate by 1.1 percent during Q2 compared to Q1. Average price per meter (longitude) of sea front reached KD 16 Thousand despite the stability of prices in the highest price area in the governorate i.e. Benaider and Jelayaa. Prices declined by 2.6 percent in Q2 in the lowest price areas e.g. Nuwaiseeb area.

Average price areas e.g. Mina Abdullah and Dhaba'eya witnessed a decline in prices by 1.7 percent in Q2, Prices declined in Al-Zour sea side area and in public benefit areas in Khairan area by 1.8 percent compared to

Prices declined in Capital governorate by 9.7 percent. Price per meter at the sea front reached KD 7000. Prices declined in Jahraa governorate by 4.7 percent thus recording

it increases slightly to KD 550 in certain areas. Average rent ranges KD 400 - 450 in Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate areas including Abu-Fatira, Addan and Sabah Al-Salem. Average value increases to reach KD 500 - 550 in some other areas. Rental value in Jahraa area ranged KD 300 - 420.

Rental value for a full floor in a private residence covering an area of 400 meters ranges KD 800 - 900 at Hawalli governorate

idence covering an area of 400 meters ranges KD 800 - 900 at Hawalli governorate and reached KD 950 in some distinguished areas therein, while it is little higher to reach KD 1000 in more distinguished areas. Rental value ranges between KD 1000 - 1100 in most of Capital governorate areas. Rental value ranges KD 680 - 780 in Ghernata while in Farwaniya area it ranges between KD 640 - 740 and reaches KD 800 in certain other distinguished places.

Average rental value ranges between KD 640 - 800 at Ahmadi governorate and reaches KD 900 in certain distinguished areas. Rental value reaches to KD 800 - 900 at Mubarak Al-Kabeer areas including Abu-Fatira area and may reach KD 1000 in areas like Masayel area. Rental value ranges KD 600 - 740 in Jahraa Governorate.

Average rental value for a full first or second floor at a private residence covering an area 400 meter ranges KD 700 - 800 and reaches KD 850 in distinguished places of Hawalli governorate. Rental value reached KD 900 in certain distinguished areas. Rental value in Capital governorate ranged KD 900 - 1000 in most of the governorate areas. The value in certain Farwania governorate areas ranges KD KD 540 - 649 for a full floor and increases in certain areas to reach KD 700.

Rental value at Ahmadi governorate ranged between KD 540 - 700 while it increased slightly in some other areas. Rental value at Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate areas ranged KD 600 - 800 and reached KD 900 in some other areas of the governorate. Rental value at Jahra governorate ranged KD 500 - 640

Investment residence rental value

Average rental value of a 2 bed room flat and a hall covering an area of 60 m in capital governorate ranged between KD 320 - 340. Rental value for the same area in Hawally governorate ranged between KD 290 - 330. Rental value for the same area ranged between KD 270 - 320 in Farwaniya Governorate and KD 200 - 290 in Ahmadi governorate. Rental values recorded KD 290 - 320 at Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate and KD 270-300 at Jahra governorate.

Rental value of a 2 bed room flats + a hall coving an area of 70 - 74 m ranged KD 350 -400 at capital governorate and KD 310 - 360 in Hawalli governorate areas. Rental value ranged between 300 - 340 in Farwaniya governorate, KD 300 - 340 in Ahmadi governorate, KD 325 - 350 at Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate and KD 310 - 330 at Jahraa governorate. Rental value for investment apartments covering an area of 80 - 85 m2 ranged between KD 420 - 450 at capital governorate and ranged between KD 365 - 440 at Hawalli governorate areas. Rental value ranged between KD 350 - 420 at Farwaniya governorate areas and ranged KD 330 - 360 at Ahmadi governorate. Rental value approximated KD 380 and KD 360 at Mubarak Al-Kabeer governorate and Jahraa governorate respectively.

Rental value for a flat coving an area of 100 - 110 m2 ranged between KD 470 - 540 in Capital governorate areas, KD 440 - 520 for Hawalli governorate areas, KD 490 for Farwaniya governorate while the value ranged KD 420 - 450 for Ahmadi governorate. Rental value increased slightly in Mubarak Al-Kabeer area ranging KD 450 - 480 and reached KD 430 - 460 at Jahraa governorate.

Prices differ according to different areas, design type, finishing and location. The property age is considered as a basic factor in determining average rental value of the property in Kuwait. We shall focus in this report on new property prices which are increasing rapidly, thus putting more pressure on the rental values of old properties available in the market. When old properties are vacant the land lord will eventually increase rent for the new tenant. Average property trading is considered a significant factor for assessment of rental value. There are distinguished areas, e.g. Shaab, Mirgab, Bneid Al Gar, Sharq and other places inside those distinguished areas e.g. Qatar and Bahrain Streets at Salmiya, real estate buildings overlooking the coast and Qutaiba and Al-Muthanna streets at Hawally. Also, there are less significant areas e.g. Jaleeb Al-Shoyoukh, Abu Halifa and Khaitan.

Commercial property rental value Average rent of a commercial meter in a

ground floor ranged KD 25 - KD 45 / m2 in Hawalli as it reached KD 35/ m2 in Kuwait city while it reached KD 50 in Salmiya. Average rent / m2 at offices ranges KD 6.5 and reaches KD 8 in certain prime areas and grand yards in Kuwait city. Also it has reached KD 7-8 /m2 in certain areas in Hawalli, Fahaheel and Mangaf and reached KD 9 in certain places, depending on location, finishing type and services provided to tenants and visitors.

Industrial plots rental value

Average rental price for industrial plots rental values per industrial square meter for a ground floor - showrooms - ranged between KD 14 - 25 at Shuwaikh industrial area and Al-Rai area. Prices differ according to different locations. Average rental price per meter at Ardiya area (warehouses) ranged between KD 6.5 - 8. This value was much higher in Ardiya (crafts) area where average price per square meter ranged between KD 20 - 25. Average price per square meter at East Ahmadi ranged between KD 12 - 18. Prices at Fahaheel industrial area ranged KD 14 - 20 per square meter.

Average Price/ M2 for Private Residence in Capital Governorate Q1 2016 and Q2 2016



Prices declined in most of the governorate areas except some areas where prices stabilized. Prices declined in the highest price areas by 3 percent e.g. government houses in Oyoun area. Prices stabilized in Mutlaa street area at Jahraa while they declined by 2.6 percent in government houses at Al-Naseem area.

Concerning price levels at each governorate, price per square meter of investment real estate declined at Capital governorate during Q2 by 1.6 percent compared to Q1 where price decline relatively. Average price per meter reached KD 2,519 in Q2 where average prices declined by 6.3 percent compared to Q2 last year.

At capital governorate level and in one of the highest price areas in Dasman area, average price per square meter declined by 1 percent compared to Q1 despite the stability of prices in internal areas and Gulf Road while they declined in Abdullah Al-Ahmed road. Decline ratio increased on quarterly basis by 1.9 percent at eastern Maqwaa during Q2 due to the significant decline in price levels at Benaid Al-Qar area by 1.4 percent which was impacted by the stability of prices in places located at Gulf road and other main places at 1st Ring Road and 2nd Ring Road. Prices declined in certain locations of Istiqlal Street.

Concerning Hawally governorate, the decline ratio of average price per meter recorded in Q1 improved on quarterly basis. Price per meter has declined by 1.6 percent in Q2. This ratio is better than the decline ratio by 3.9 percent recorded in Q1. Despite this improvement the decline ratio has increased on annual basis in Q2 thus recording 12.1 percent compared to the same period last year.

Farwania governorate

Prices declined in Farwaniya area by 2.1 percent compared to Q1. Places overlooking airport road recorded a decline by 1.8 percent. Decline ratio was higher in internal areas. Prices decline in Jaleeb Al-Shoyoukh by 3.3 percent . Prices have also declined by 4.8 percent in certain locations at police station road and 3.7 percent in locations overlooking 6th ring road. Average price per meter declined in Khaitan area by 1.8 percent and price levels declined by the same ratio in certain places of Airport Street. Decline ratio reached 2.8 percent in certain internal places.

Prices declined in Ahmadi are by 3.1 percent in Q2 on quarterly basis compared to a decline by 4.3 percent in Q1. Average price per meter reached KD 1,369 in Q2 compared to a decline in prices by 15 percent in the governorate compared to last year. Prices levels in Ahmadi governorate recorded the highest decline ratios among governorates.

Concerning price development in governorate areas, price levels declined in the highest price investment areas of the governorate. Average price per meter declined in Mangaf area by 2.2 percent compared to Q1 followed by Fahaheel which has recorded a decline by 4.2 percent. Prices declined by 3.8 percent in highest price places in the governorate. Prices declined by 5.7 percent in certain internal low value places of the

Prices declined in Abu-Halifa area by 3.1 percent. Decline ratio reached 5.7 percent in certain internal places of the area. Certain locations at the coastal strip recorded a decline by 1.4 percent compared to Q1. Prices declined in Fintas area in Q2 by 2.4 percent. Prices declined in Mahboula area by 3.8 percent. Decline ratio reached its highest level among governorate areas thus recording 10 percent in certain internal locations covering an area of 1000 sm.

Commercial real estates at capital governorate witnessed a decline in price per square meter compared to Q1 2016 in most of the areas except some areas which have witnessed remarkable stability. Prices declined in certain places of Mubarak Al-Kabeer St. at the downtown area by 4.8 percent although this area is no longer the properties increased in Q2 compared to Q1 this year. 

CLINTON PROPOSES PLAN TO ADDRESS MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT

SOUTHAMPTON, NEW YORK: Hillary Clinton is tion and create a national initiative for suicide rolling out a comprehensive plan to address millions of Americans coping with mental illness, pointing to the need to fully integrate mental health services into the nation's health care sys-

Clinton's campaign released a multi-pronged approach to mental health care on Monday, aimed at ensuring that Americans would no longer separate mental health from physical health in terms of access, care and quality of

The Democratic presidential nominee's agenda would focus on early diagnosis and interven-

prevention. If elected, Clinton would hold a White House conference on mental health within her first year in office.

Clinton's proposal would also aim to enforce mental health parity laws and provide training to law enforcement officers to deal with people grappling with mental health problems while prioritizing treatment over jail for low-level offenders. "Building on her longstanding commitment to health care for all, Hillary believes everyone should be able to access quality mental health care - without shame, stigma or barriers," said Maya Harris, a senior policy adviser to Clinton's campaign, in a statement.

The former secretary of state planned to hold a town hall meeting by telephone with stakeholders on yesterday during a three-day fundraising spree in the Hamptons. The policy rollout would overlap with a Clinton plan to address drug and alcohol addiction which she campaigned on in Iowa and New Hampshire after hearing frequently about the problems

43.6 million adults with mental illness

The federal government estimated in 2014 that about 43.6 million adults in the US had mental illness in the past year, or about 1 in 5 adults age 18 and over. It estimated nearly 10 million adults suffered from serious mental illness.

An estimated 17 million children in the US experience mental health problems, including 1 in 5 college students, according to the National Alliance on Mental Illness. Nearly 1 in 5 veterans returning from the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan experienced post-traumatic stress or depression.

Clinton's campaign said the plan would attempt to integrate the nation's health care system to create a more seamless way of providing both medical and mental health treatment to

It would expand the reimbursement systems for collaborative care models under Medicare and Medicaid that aim to treat patients through a team of health care professionals, including a primary care doctor, a care manager and a behavioral health specialist.

It would also be helped by a Clinton proposal to boost funding for community health centers that she announced earlier in the summer along with Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders, her primary rival.

Money for the centers, a priority for Sanders, was increased under the Affordable Care Act. Clinton's plan would make the money for the centers permanent and expand it by \$40 billion over the next decade. —AP

MORE US COUNTIES TO SEE OBAMACARE MARKETPLACE MONOPOLY

early a third of US counties will likely be served by only one insurer that participates in an Affordable Care Act (ACA) marketplace in 2017, according to an analysis published Sunday by the Kaiser Family Foundation.

The 31 percent of US counties that will have just a single option of insurers within the ACA's exchanges would represent an increase from 7 percent this year, the nonpartisan group found.

UnitedHealth Group Inc and Aetna Inc have decided to largely exit governmentrun online marketplaces in 2017 that sell subsidized plans created under President Barack Obama's national healthcare reform law, citing low enrollment and high service costs.

The bulk of the decrease in counties with a choice of insurers is due to UnitedHealth's pullback, which was announced in April. The data underscores the degree to which industry retrenchment is curtailing individual's options within the marketplaces. Insurer departures may lead to higher costs within that market, analysts have said.

One county - Pinal County, Arizona risks having no insurer options at all within the marketplace, the analysis found. However, the study's authors said another plan offered elsewhere in the state could expand to serve the county. The foundation also said it could take more months and more data for the full impact of the changes for 2017 to become clear.

A spokeswoman for the US Department of Health and Human Services was not immediately available for comment, but the agency has said that the ACA has helped increase the number of options available to individuals. —Reuters

PLAYING WITH SPORTS CONCUSSION DOUBLES RECOVERY TIME: STUDY

CHICAGO: Continuing to play despite a concussion doubles recovery time for teen athletes and leads to worse short-term mental function than in those immediately removed from action, a study found.

on Sunday. —AP

It's billed as the first to compare recovery outcomes for athletes removed from a game or practice compared with those who aren't. The study was small, involving 69 teens treated at a University of Pittsburgh Medical Center concussion clinic, but the results bolster evidence supporting the growing number of return-to-play laws and policies nationwide The study was published yesterday in the journal Pediatrics.

Keeping score

The study involved athletes aged 15 on average from several

sports, including football, soccer, ice hockey and basketball who had concussions during a game or practice. Half continued to play and took 44 days on average to recover from symptoms, versus 22 days in those who were immediately sidelined.

Sidelined players reported symptoms immediately, including dizziness, headaches, mental fogginess and fatigue, and were diagnosed with concussions by trainers or team physicians. The others, who continued playing for 19 minutes on average, delayed reporting symptoms and were diagnosed later.

Those who continued to play had worse scores on mental function tests performed eight days after the concussion and 30 days after the concussion. Medical had been similar in all players before their concussions.

Risky returns

Return-to-play policies are widespread, especially in youth athletics, and they typically recommend sidelining players after a suspected concussion until symptoms resolve. One of the main reasons is to prevent a rare condition called secondimpact syndrome - potentially fatal brain swelling or bleeding that can occur when a player still recovering from a concussion gets hit again in the head.

The study results show that a prolonged recovery is another important risk from returning to play too soon - one that "no one had really calculated" until now, said Dr. Allen Sills, a Vanderbilt

About 300,000 sports-related concussions occur each year nationwide among all ages. In high school athletics, they occur at a rate of almost 3 per 10,000 games or practices.

Evidence suggests up to 50 percent of concussions in teen sports aren't reported. Athletes are sometimes not aware they've experienced a concussion, or they suspect a head injury but continue playing because "they don't want to let their teammates down," said University of Arkansas concussion researcher R.J. Elbin, the study's lead author. The results "give us more ammunition" to persuade young athletes to heed the returnto-play advice, Elbin said. —AP

MYLAN LAUNCHING GENERIC VERSION OF THE EPIPEN

NEW YORK: Mylan says it will make available a generic version of its EpiPen, as criticism mounts over the price of its injectable medicine. The company said yesterday that its US subsidiary will put out a generic version of the EpiPen that will have a list price of \$300 for a twopack - about half the current price. It will be available in both 0.15 mg and 0.30 mg strenaths.

EpiPens are used in emergencies to treat severe allergies to insect bites and foods like nuts and eggs that can lead to anaphylactic shock. People usually keep a number of EpiPens handy at home, school or work. The syringes, prefilled with the hormone epinephrine, expire after a year.

Mylan N.V. said that it anticipates having the generic versions available in the next several weeks. It will continue to market and distribute a branded EpiPen.

The company charges \$608 for a twopack of the branded EpiPen. Mylan said it will keep in place the \$300 savings card for the branded EpiPen and the revised patient assistance program announced last week.

Consumers and politicians have accused the company of price-gouging, considering that the product has been on the market since 1987 and the price didn't start rising significantly until Mylan acquired it in 2007. There is also little competition, with the only rival product being Adrenaclick, which carries a list price of \$461.

Mylan CEO Heather Bresch has defended the price hikes, saying the company only received \$274 of the total price for a twin-package while insurers, pharmacies and other parties divvy up the rest.

Numerous members of Congress and other politicians this week have called for congressional hearings on Mylan's pricing, an investigation by the Federal Trade Commission and action by the Food and Drug Administration to increase competition by speeding up approvals of any rival products.

At least two companies are trying to get US approval to sell a rival brand or generic version of EpiPen. None is likely to hit the US market until well into next year. Relief could come sooner from Imprimis Pharmaceuticals, a compounding pharmacy that prepares medicines to fill individual prescriptions. It said it might be able to sell a version in a few months and would likely charge around \$100 for two injectors.—AP

UAE'S NMC HEALTH EXPANDS INTO SAUDI, RAISES 2017 EBITDA FORECAST

ABU DHABI: NMC Health said yesterday it had expanded into Saudi Arabia through an investment and an acquisition, the first foray into the wider Gulf for the United Arab Emirates-based healthcare provider.

This enabled it to raise its guidance for 2017 group EBITDA (earnings before interest, tax, depreciation and amortization) to \$300 million from the previously-disclosed \$290 million, NMC said in a statement. NMC, along with other companies, is tapping into substantial growth in the sector as the Gulf's increasingly wealthy population becomes more susceptible to lifestyle diseases such as diabetes. It has taken a majority stake in a new 120-bed hospital in Jeddah by putting \$4 million of equity into the operating company.

NMC will also provide a \$9 million two-year loan to its subsidiary Provita, which will manage the business. It has also acquired a 70 percent stake in As Salama Hospital in the kingdom's Eastern Province for \$28 million, adding 140 beds to its total count.

"This represents another major advance towards our objective of developing a regional leader in the field of specialist long-term care," said B.R. Shetty, chief executive of NMC. As well as plans to revamp the existing facilities at Khobar-based

As Salama, NMC said its strategy includes possible investment and expansion in the central region of Saudi, which includes the capital, Riyadh.

The London-listed firm now has 1,135 operational beds across its network, which is primarily in the UAE but also includes Spanish fertility firm Clinica Eugin. It generated EBITDA of \$115.9 million in the first half of 2016, up 68.2 percent over same period of last year. —Reuters

SINGAPORE MASS SPRAYS RESIDENCES AS ZIKA EXPECTED TO SPREAD

SINGAPORE: Officials sprayed insecticide and cleared drains of stagnant water in residential areas of Singapore at high risk of further Zika infections vesterday after 41 locally transmitted cases were confirmed in the city state.

Workers wearing fumigation masks travelled methodically through highrise public housing estates in seven separate areas of the island, inspecting plant pots closely as they sprayed insecticide via thermal fogging machines.

41 and counting

The health ministry on Saturday confirmed Singapore's first locallytransmitted case of Zika, with the tally rising to 41 just a day later. All of the infected people were either residents of the Aljunied district or workers at a construction site owned by GuocoLand in the area. "We expect to identify more positive cases," the ministry said on Monday in its latest update on the

"Given that the majority of Zika cases are asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic, and mosquitoes in the affected areas may already have been infected, isolation of positive cases may have limited effect to managing the spread," it

Singapore, a major regional financial centre and busy transit hub, which maintains a constant vigil against the mosquito-borne dengue virus, reported its first case of the Zika virus in May, brought in by a middle-aged man who had been to Brazil.

GuocoLand, which is headquartered in Singapore and has developments

across Asia, was ordered on Saturday to stop work on the building site where 36 of the infected people worked. It will remain closed until the company rectifies the conditions that allowed mosquitoes to breed and steps up preventative measures, the health ministry said.

The Zika virus, carried by mosquitoes, was detected in Brazil last year and has since spread across the Americas. It poses a risk to pregnant women because it can cause severe birth defects. It has been linked in Brazil to more than 1,600 cases of microcephaly, where babies are born with abnormally small heads and

The World Health Organization said on Sunday it did not know "which lineage of Zika is circulating" in Singapore or "what the level of population immunity is to this lineage of Zika in Asia."

Singapore's health ministry said some 19 mosquito breeding habitats were detected and destroyed in its first sweep of the Aljunied area on Sunday when it fumigated around a third of the 6,000 homes. "I feel afraid," said Ng Kai Yee, an 18-year-old female student who lives near the construction site believed to be a source of the outbreak. "I heard quite a lot about how harmful Zika virus is to girls, especially pregnant women."

Authorities have urged those living and working in the risk areas, especially pregnant women, to monitor their health and seek medical attention if they are unwell. Of the 41 people known to have been infected, 34 have already fully recovered. Only the first case reported was a woman. —Reuters

SOUTHEAST ASIA NEEDS TO UP ITS GAME TO COMBAT ZIKA

'UNDER-REPORTED AND UNDER-DIAGNOSED'

BANGKOK/KUALA LUMPUR: The spread of the Zika virus across tropical Southeast Asia is likely to be significantly under-reported as local health authorities fail to conduct adequate screening, regional experts said yesterday.

International travel hub Singapore confirmed 41 locallytransmitted cases of the mosquitoborne virus on Sunday and said it anticipated more, raising fears about how quickly it could disperse throughout the region. Other parts of Southeast Asia have reported dozens of cases of Zika, which in Brazil has been linked to thousands of suspected cases of microcephaly, a rare birth defect, but there are fears the true numbers are masked.

"Zika is under-reported and under-diagnosed," Khin Myint, head of $\bar{t}he$ emerging virus research unit at Indonesia's government-funded Eijkman Institute, told Reuters. "We find many cases are not presented in hospitals because it's a relatively mild disease with mild symptoms and people are not going to doctors."

The World Health Organization (WHO) lists Indonesia, Thailand, the Philippines and Vietnam as countries with "possible endemic transmission or evidence of local mosquito-borne Zika infections in

But the Jakarta-based Eijkman Institute, the main body testing for Zika in Indonesia, said it tested only 1,000 people in the past year - a tiny number in Southeast Asia's most populous country. It found just one positive case, despite reports that Zika is prevalent in the

number of cases in the region at almost 100 infected people across 10 veys have not been through enough," said Kriengsak Limkittikul, assistant professor at the Department of Tropical Medicine at Mahidol University in Bangkok, noting that people without symptoms are often not tested. "Screening is inadequate in other countries in the region, too, where health authorities are ill-equipped to test." he said.

Muhamad Subuh, a senior Indonesian health ministry official, said authorities are "in the process of stepping up health checks at main airports and ports, including in Batam," the island closest to Singapore.

Indonesia introduced thermal scanners at airports targeting arrivals from Singapore over the weekend, and plans to roll them out to ports. Authorities are also handing out printed warnings to all incoming passengers, noting Zika has an incubation period of around 10 days before presenting any symptoms.

Malaysian Health Minister Subramaniam Sathasivam said travellers who enter Johor Bahru, where up to 200,000 people commute daily to and from Singapore, will go through thermal screening at border checkpoints. People crossing in private vehicles will not be scanned but handed a pamphlet detailing the symptoms and asking them to report to authorities if they develop those.

Malaysia is also stepping up vector control mechanisms including fogging and larvicidal spraying in Johor Bharu. "What we can do as a country comes down to how well we control our vectors, and at this point of time, dengue is still a bigger problem than Zika because people can die from dengue," Subramaniam said.

Other countries were not responding so quickly. In Thailand, the Department of Disease Control said it was screening athletes returning from the Olympic Games in Brazil, but otherwise not changing its prevention methods. Vietnam and Cambodia made no immediate changes to their border

"Different countries have different economic and political situations and it's not that they don't want to screen the virus, but they don't have the resources and capacity to do it at this stage," said Jasper Fuk-Woo Chan, a clinical assistant professor at the Carol Yu Centre for Infection at the University of Hong Kong. —Reuters

Why it matters: Climate change

WASHINGTON: It's as if Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump live on two entirely different Earths: One warming, one not. Clinton says climate change "threatens us all," while Trump tweets that global warming is "mythical" and repeatedly refers to it as a "hoax." Measurements and scientists say Clinton's Earth is much closer to reality.

As heat-trapping gases in the air intensify and hot temperature records shatter, global warming is taking a toll on Americans' everyday life : their gardens, air, water, seasons, insurance rates and more.

Where they stand

Trump calls attempts to remedy global warming "just a very, very expensive form of tax." He tells coal miners he'll get their jobs back. Solar power now employs four times more people than coal mining.

Clinton proposes to spend \$60 billion to switch from dirty fossil fuels to cleaner energy. She says clean energy is needed, otherwise it would "force our children to endure the catastrophe that would result from unchecked climate change." She promises to deliver on the President Barack Obama's pledge that by 2025, the U.S. will be emit-

ting 30 percent less heat-trapping gases than in 2005.

Why it matters

Dozens of measurements show Earth is warming. And it's worsening. The overwhelming majority of climate scientists and nearly every professional organization of scientists have said climate change is real, man-made and a problem.

The last 15 months in a row have set records globally for heat, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The world is on pace to break the record for hottest year, a record broken in 2010, 2014 and 2015. The five hottest years recorded have all been from 2005 on and it is about 1.8 degrees warmer than a century ago.

But it's more than temperatures. Arctic sea ice keeps flirting with record low amounts. Hot water has been killing coral as never before seen. Scientists have connected man-made climate change to extreme weather, including deadly heat waves, droughts and flood-inducing downpours. They even have connected it as one of several factors in the Syrian drought and civil war that led to a massive refugee crisis.

Climate change is causing the seas to rise, which threatens coastlines. Sea level has risen a

foot in the waters around New York City in the past century, worsening flooding from Superstorm Sandy. And it is making people sicker with worsened allergies and asthma, heat deaths, diseases spread by ticks and mosquitoes, dirtier air and more contaminated water and food, a federal report said in April.

Changing the world's economy from burning fossil fuel, which causes global warming, has a huge pricetag. So does not doing anything. The world's average income will shrivel 23 percent by the year 2100 if carbon dioxide pollution continues at the current pace, according to a 2015 study out of Stanford and the University of California Berkeley.

Just the Obama administration's efforts to cut carbon pollution from 1,000 power plants projects to cost about \$8 billion a year, but save several times more than in reduced health problems.

The world's largest general scientific society warns of "abrupt, unpredictable, and potentially irreversible changes with highly damaging impacts." It may seem improbable that government action can restore balance to something as vast as the climate. But presidents Ronald Reagan and George H.W. Bush showed that big things can be done about air pollution. They took steps that reduced ozone depletion and acid rain. —AP

ate Parker, the actor-director dealing with a 17 year-old rape case casting a storm over his new film and career, opened up about the incident in a new interview. Parker spoke about understanding his male privilege and the definition of consent in a lengthy interview Friday with Ebony magazine in Los Angeles. Earlier this month, the Hollywood trade press began to run stories about a 1999 rape allegation made against Parker when he was a student at Penn State University. Parker was charged and later acquitted. The accuser killed herself in 2012. Earlier this month, he gave two interviews to Variety and Deadline that received much attention. He told Ebony that in those interviews he "was acting as if I was the victim, and that's wrong." Parker wrote, directed and will star in "The Birth of a Nation," out in October. The film, about Nat Turner and the slave rebellion, is already generating Oscar buzz. "I called a couple of sisters that (I) know that are in the space that talk about the feminist movement and toxic masculinity, and just asked questions. What did I do wrong? Because I was thinking about myself. And what I realized is that I never took a moment to think about the woman," he told Ebony he did after his first pair of interviews. "I didn't think about her (the accuser) then, and I didn't think about her when I was saying those statements, which was wrong and insensitive." Parker said that he needs to seek information that will make him stronger,



Juan Gabriel, legendary Mexican singer, dies at 66

uan Gabriel, one of Mexico's leading singers and songwriters, died Sunday. He was 66. TMZ reports that Gabriel died in Santa Monica, Calif., of a suspected heart attack. His body is currently with the Los Angeles County medical examiner, and no foul play is expected. Gabriel had just embarked on the biggest tour of his career. He was in the middle of the US leg of his 22-city MeXXico Es Todos tour, playing to soldout crowds on 360 stages. He had most recently performed in Los Angeles at the Forum on Friday night. The Mexican icon was one of the country's top earners in music. Over his career, Gabriel has sold more than 30 million records. Last year, he earned \$11.6 million in touring revenue. His 13th album, "Los Duo," was the top-selling Latin album of the year in 2015. Gabriel was born Alberto Aguilera Valadez in the small town of Paracuaro, Michoacan, in 1950, the youngest of ten siblings. He got his start in music at a young age, being sent to boarding school at the age of five where a teacher, Juan Contreras, encouraged his singing and writing talents. He ran away from boarding school at the age of 15. He would go on to sign a record contract with RCA Records in 1971, when he was 21, and officially changed his name. He became known to fans for his songs of love and heartbreak. On stage, he performed his mariachi tunes flamboyantly, jumping about in bright colors and sequined jackets. Over the course of his career, he received many honors, including a Lifetime Achievement Award from La Opinion Tributo Nacional, a People's Choice Latin Music Award and a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

More than 100 arrested, dozens hurt at Notting Hill Carnival









ondon police arrested more than 100 people amid sporadic violence Sunday at the annual Notting Hill Carnival, an annual celebration of Caribbean culture in the British capital that often includes trouble on the sidelines. The Metropolitan Police reported at least four knife attacks during the opening day of the two-day festival in west London. It said four males aged 15 to 20 were wounded, with one 15-year-old boy hospitalized in critical condition. Sunday's festivities included a colorful child-oriented parade through west London that attracted tens of thousands of revelers, many of whom danced in the streets to the sound of steel drums and reggae bands.

Scores of paramedics were on hand to provide MASH-style units for carnival-goers injured or unwell from alcohol or drugs. Medical beds were deployed at roadsides in some locations. The London Ambulance Service reported shortly before midnight that 411 people had received medical care at the carnival, 77 of whom needed to be hospitalized. Police said 105 people were arrested on charges that included drug possession, carrying knives, assault, sexual offenses and theft. The carnival, founded in 1966 by West Indian immigrants following the Notting Hill race riots of 1958, frequently has involved clashes with police. Many local businesses have closed during the event since 1977, when police stormed the carnival amid looting of shops. The 2008 festivities ended in a street riot.

Last year, police arrested 407 people, a record for an event where knifings committed by youth gangs have become a troubling trend. This year police have deployed a 7,000-strong force to keep the peace. The carnival remains one of Europe's biggest street parties with hundreds of thousands attending each year. It takes place at the end of August on the last two days of a three-day weekend. — AP





eyonce proved once again she is the contemporary rock star, and she used the MTV Video Music Awards stage to showcase her skills and outshine her peers, from Rihanna to Britney Spears. Beyonce won eight awards, including video of the year, and performed five songs from her visual album "Lemonade" in an epic 16-minute concert Sunday that had the audience at Madison Square Garden in awe. She sang live, danced heavily and worked the crowd as she ran through "Pray You Catch Me," "Hold Up," "Sorry," "Don't Hurt Yourself" and "Formation," which won the top prize over Adele, Drake, Justin Bieber and Kanye West.

"First of all, I'd like to thank my beautiful daughter and my incredible husband for all of their support," said Beyonce, who walked the carpet with daughter Blue Ivy and the mothers of Trayvon Martin, Michael Brown and Eric Garner - who all appeared in "Lemonade" movie. It was reminiscent of the 2014 VMAs, when Beyonce also performed for 16 minutes and accepted the Michael Jackson Video Vanguard award. This year it was awarded to Rihanna, who split up her performances throughout the night, singing hits such as "Work," "We Found Love" and "Love on the Brain." But the biggest moment for Rihanna came when Drake - in a tuxedo - presented the award to his former girlfriend. He said he met Rihanna in 2005 on the set of her first music video for "Pon de Replay."

My family, my fans, my country

"She's someone I've been in love with her since I was 22 years old," Drake said as Rihanna blushed and the audience cheered loudly. "She's one of my best friends in the world. All of my adult life I've looked up to her even though she's younger than me." Rihanna, 28, thanked her family, friends and hometown of Saint Michael, Barbados, for helping her succeed in her 11-year-career. "My success started as my dream, but now my success is not my own. It's my family, my fans, my country ...it's women, it's black women," she said.

Beyonce's top-notch performance starkly contrasted with that of Spears, who returned to the VMA stage after 10 years. Not only did she lip sync, in typical fashion, but she did so badly. Spears performed her hit "Make Me..." and danced slickly, but she didn't actually sing a word of the song live. She was joined by rapper G-Eazy - and she lip synched the hook to his hit song, "Me, Myself and I." In true Kanye fashion, the rapper ranted onstage, touching on subjects from music to his beef with Taylor Swift to violence in his hometown Chicago before he debuted his music video for "Fade," which starred Teyana Taylor. He talked about his "Famous" video, which features what appear to be naked images of himself, his wife Kim Kardashian, Swift, Donald Trump and others. He even pointed to former girlfriend Amber Rose, who was in the audience and is also in the video.

Drake won best hip hop video for "Hotline Bling" and Calvin Harris won best male video for "This is What You Came For." David Bowie - who died from cancer earlier this year received four nominations for "Lazarus" and won best art direction. The music video, which shows him looking frail in bed with bandaged eyes, was released just days before the

icon's Jan 10 death. Performers included Nick Jonas, The Chainsmokers, Ty Dollar \$ign and Ariana Grande, who brought spin class to the VMA stage when she sang the reggae-tinged "Side to Side" with Nicki Minaj.

How to convert your spare room into a dream closet

Longing for a bigger closet?

Remember that rooms in your home don't have to be used the way they were originally intended. Get creative and convert a small room into the ultimate walk-in closet, says Egypt Sherrod, host of HGTV's "Flipping Virgins" and "Property Virgins." "Homes built before the '80s just didn't have the room size that today's buyers have become used to, or the walk-in closets we've been trained to expect," she says. You've picked out your dream flooring, new appliances and cabinets-okay, so how are you going to pay for that renovation? Giving up a room can be a big decision. The trick is doing it on a minimal budget and retaining the flexibility to use the room differently in the future, says Kevin O'Connor, host of PBS'"This Old House."

Choosing the space

Ideally, use the bedroom closest to the master bedroom, says Sherrod: "That way you have the option of opening up the wall to go directly in." Creating a doorway in a wall is relatively minor construction and can easily be undone, experts say.

DIY creativity

The simplest way to convert a small room is by lining the

walls with clothing racks on wheels and with free-standing wire shelving units. You can customize the space by adding colorful bins and baskets. Or you can create shelving that expresses your personal style. For a recent "This Old House" episode, O'Connor worked with a homeowner to build closet storage out of black metal pipes with wooden shelves. The industrial look brought a dose of style to the space, and the

"The few places they anchor to the wall give you nice rigidity," O'Connor says, but the shelves also are easily remov-

Another DIY project: To fill the centre of a room that Sherrod converted to a closet, she brought in two large bureaus of the same height and arranged them back-to-back. She had a sheet of granite cut to cover the tops, creating a work island that combines storage and a flat surface for arranging accessories or stacking folded laundry.

Interior designer Mikel Welch, previously a competitor on "HGTV Design Stars," says another option is bringing in a pretty table for the centre of the room. "For those who like to lay out their attire to help them choose their outfit for the day, a table would be perfect," he says. And for changing or trying

the space will certainly come in handy." The finishing touch: Prop up a framed, full-length mirror on one wall. "It's sort of a boutique hotel look," O'Connor says, and easy to remove if you repurpose the room.

Consider a system

For a finished look with no DIY effort, there are many closet systems that offer a mix of hanging space and shelves. Some are free-standing and others are anchored to the walls.

The more permanent systems are made to look like builtins, Welch says, and "are a great way to maximize the space with a more customized look." He recommends California Closets and Poliform for portable closets and wardrobe units. He also likes the Italian brand Porro Storage: "They put a chic spin on a typical storage unit," he says. Additional pieces worth considering: "A great planning tool is a valet rod, which is a pullout rod that you can lay out your outfit for the next day on or use for staging for a trip," says Sarah Fishburne, director of trend and design at Home Depot. "I use mine all the time." If you have enough space, she suggests adding jewelry trays and racks designed for belts and ties: "Some


things on, "having a snazzy upholstered bench or chaise in spin, and some you can slide out with plenty of space," she

Bonuses and obstacles

A bedroom repurposed as a closet has ventilation and natural light that's lacking in many closets. "For people who care about getting the tie to match the jacket," O'Connor says, "there's nothing better than natural light."

For the best possible lighting, Fishburne suggests adding dimmers to a walk-in closet and choosing lightbulbs carefully (she likes LED daylight bulbs).

One challenge: Closet doors are designed to swing out, but bedroom doors generally swing into the room. So the door to your new walk-in closet will swing in unless you decide to remove it. Adding sliding pocket doors can be expensive, O'Connor says, but they're a nice luxury to finish off your ultimate walk-in closet. — AP
