

KUWAIT: A fire that erupted at an oil well in northern Kuwait has been extinguished, KUNA reported yesterday. Government-run Kuwait Oil Co announced the fire earlier in the day, with an official saying that firefighters were working to put it out. Company spokesman Saad Al-Azmi was quoted by KUNA saying the incident began with an oil spill that happened late Tuesday. He did not specify where it took place or anything about its size. KUWAIT: Chairman of the newly established telecommunications authority Salem Al-Othainah explained that the authority has been established to regulate and organize the local telecom business, set rules and monitor the services subscribers receive, be they calls or Internet serv-

ices. Othainah also stressed that talks ing the telecom market once national about establishing a fourth telecom company was still premature and could not be confirmed or denied because the authority had requested conducting a comprehensive study of the local telecom market before making the final decision. State security law

The constitutional court's contests committee yesterday accepted a contest arguing the unconstitutionality of article 4 of the state security law and decided reviewing it by the court later. Lawyer Refai Al-Ajmi argued that the article states: "He who, without government permission, mobilizes troops or commits any hostilities against a foreign country in a way that might subject Kuwait to war or cutting diplomatic relations would be punished by temporary imprisonment of not less than three years and in case such actions do cause war or cutting diplomatic relations, the penalty would be life imprisonment", which is very vague in terms of defining 'hostilities.' He argued that accordingly, bloggers had been prosecuted over freedom of expression cases though 'hostilities' should involve substantial actual actions while bloggers only commit verbal slander. "The court will look into the contest and if it is accepted, this article will be cancelled or the term 'hostilities' would be more elaborately explained," he added.

GULF SUBSIDY REFORMS NOT ENOUGH TO PLUG DEFICIT: MOODY'S DUBAI: Fuel subsidy reforms by Gulf

states will help reduce pressure on budgets but are not enough to offset deficits resulting from low oil prices, ratings agency Moody's said. Savings from increased fuel prices in the six Gulf nations will average 0.5 percent of gross domestic product (GDP) — around \$7 billion-this year against an estimated deficit of 12.4 percent of GDP, it said.

"Recent moves to reform subsidies signal political willingness to address the damaging effect of low oil prices on budgets," said Moody's analyst Mathias Angonin. "However, they fall short of the scale of economic and fiscal reform required to achieve budget balance," he said.

All the six Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states, which depend heavily on oil income, have reduced generous fuel, electricity and other subsidies to cut spending in the face of falling revenues. The GCC groups energy-rich Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman,

Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates. All of them posted a budget deficit last year.

Moody's forecast that the price of oil will average \$33 a barrel in 2016, way below its price of around \$110 a barrel before it began to decline in mid-2014. It estimated the price to be \$38 a barrel next year.

"While the GCC governments" balance sheets remain solid on a consolidated basis, we anticipate a sharp deterioration in the governments' net asset position as a consequence of the decline in oil prices," Moody's said.

The reforms will however lead to efficiency gains, reduce distortions caused by very low prices and cut domestic energy consumption, it said. Moody's expects GCC states to take other fiscal measures such as raising corporate taxes and introducing value-added taxes in the face of a long period of low oil rev-

MUNICIPALITY DENIES ALLOCATING ONLY ONE DAY FOR EXPATRIATES

KUWAIT: Kuwait Municipality strongly denied any plans to accept expatriates' transactions only on Tuesdays, said informed sources. Some bloggers have published a fake copy of an alleged decision issued by the municipality to announce this, the sources noted. The municipality also stressed that employees responsible for making and circulating such fake directives would be held accountable because it would never discriminate between citizens' and expats' transactions.

Mubarakiya market

Chairman of the Capital committee in the Municipal Council Hassan Kamal yesterday accompanied the committee's rapporteur Ali Al-Mousa, the council's secretary general Yousif Al-Sogobi and the municipality's deputy director Yousif Al-Menawer on a tour of Mubarakiya market, where they reviewed possible means to develop the Mubarakiya market area and add new services to the site to make it a touristic, economic and recreational attraction.

In this regard, Kamal said that the location was so vital and that a security checkpoint would be added to the new amenities to be built there because the area is being visited by all citizens, expats and visitors, as it is a highly significant and historic one. "Street name signs will be used in both Arabic and English in the surrounding area," he added, noting that electric golf carts would be also provided for elderly people within the market.

Moussa stressed that the area was a major tourist attraction because of its unique design and historic significance. He added that new parking areas would be added and that the market's entries and exits would be developed.

Amendments

Municipal Council member and head of Hawally committee Yousif Al-Ghareeb demanded reconsidering the amendments the Cabinet recently approved to municipal law number 5/2005 because some of those amendments had been done without enough studies. Ghareeb gave examples of amendments that had been hastily made by the penalties imposed on committing construction-related violations, holding owners legally responsible for them without referring to official bodies that had allowed them in the first place, and increasing the number of municipal council mem-

Too many topics

Chairman of the municipal council's legal and financial committee Mane Al-Ajmi said that most of the topics in a recent meeting agenda had been postponed because they were too many to discuss. Ajmi added that a letter from the fatwa and legislation department concerning regulations of building telecom towers was discussed and that the council's secretariat general had been asked to rephrase the regulations chart before making the final decision on the committee's next meeting. "The regulations include conditioning building those towers at least 12-20 meters away from private residences," he said.

FIVE ARRESTED FOR ATTACKING OFFICER

KUWAIT: The Interior Ministry's Relations and Security Information Department announced that police arrested a person who attacked a police officer yesterday along with four accomplices. Footage of the suspect who performed an indecent gesture then attacked the officer went viral on social media yesterday. The officer had to be taken to the hospital with what appeared to be a rib injury. The prime suspect was identified as Ibrahim Mohammad Ibrahim, Jordanian, 32. His accomplices were identified as Mohammad Nasser, Syrian, 20, Ahmad

Abdelmohsen, Egyptian, 23, Sultan Thamer Al-Mugaihet, Kuwaiti, 24 and Falah Hassan Ali, bedoon (stateless). All suspects were under the influence of drugs during the time of arrest, the ministry said. They were taken to the proper authorities for further action.

Foul play Investigations are ongoing to identify a suspect believed to have set three cars on fire yesterday. Evidence of foul play have been found on the scene where the fire was reported. Firefighters had rushed to the scene after three persons reported that their vehicles were set ablaze while parked outside their homes.

Truck driver arrested

Border security arrested a sewage water tanker truck driver while emptying sewage in the border area south of the country. The driver was taken to the environment police department for further action.

Embezzlement

A citizen who owns a company that specializes in selling water tanks filed a complaint against two Egyptian workers for breach of trust, saying that they embezzled almost KD 18,000 and left the country on February 14, 2016.

KUWAIT ARMS LAW REDUCES DEADLY, HARMFUL INCIDENTS

KUWAIT: The unlicensed arms and explosives' collection law, a year after its enforcement, has resulted in substantially reducing rates of incidents or accidents that lead to fatalities or critical injuries. Moreover, it has led to lower shooting occurrences during ceremonies.

The law enforcement, coupled with a media campaign, has resulted in collecting 9,407 guns, pistols (revolvers) and 'Showzen' rifles, more than 59 tons of ammunition, thus boosting the State efforts for maintaining peoples' safety.

Brigadier Abdulrahman Al-Suhail, the head of the General Directorate for Arms Collection of the Ministry of Interior, said in an interview with KUNA that the department would continue carrying out surprise raids to cleanse the country of unlicensed arms, ammunition and explosives, emphasizing "the law would be enforced equally on every-one."

No pardon There will be no pardon for those who have retained their arms beyond the four-month grace period for voluntary handover, according to instructions of Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Mohammad Al-Khaled Al-Sabah, Undersecretary Lieutenant General Sulaiman Al-Fahad and Assistant **Undersecretary for Criminal Security** Major General Abdulhamid Al-

Tasked personnel, in coordination

with the traffic authority, the special security and the media security departments, have been, after obtaining necessary legal permissions, searching suspected vehicles on main roads and alleyways for concealed unlicensed weapons. The search on the roads is a prelude to raiding locations with suspected hidden arms or explosives.

Brigadier Suhail added that the Mol personnel have set up checkpoints, data gathering points and have obtained judicial approval for raiding hideouts of persons who have not heeded the warning to surrender their arms or ammunition. He also urged informants to call 112 to report about concealment or possession of such ordnance.

Deadly incidents

Meanwhile, Brigadier Adel Al-Hashash, the head of the General Directorate of Relations and Security Information, said that the law enforcement has contributed to cutting rates of violent and deadly incidents. He called on citizens and residents to help in the efforts to stop shooting into the air during joyful or sad occasions. The Mol has carried out a media campaign, simultaneously with executing the arms law, targeting all concerned segments of the society, he said, expressing gratitude to all those who have interacted with the campaign and have given up their guns.

Major Abdullah Al-Dosari, in charge of reports at the operations

central general directorate, said reports and tip-offs about hearing sound of gunfire shooting dropped from 1,042 in 2014 to 405 in 2015, those witnessing shooting fell from 947 in 2014 to 482 in 2015. Calls about shooting during weddings decreased from 415 in 2013 to 291 in 2014 and 83 the next year. Enforcing the law has also resulted in increasing number of calls about arms possession, reaching 37 in 2015, compared to 19 in 2014.

Maintaining security

Meanwhile, eminent Kuwaiti lawyer Dokhi Al-Hasban, who doubles as Assistant Secretary General of the Arab Lawyers Union, lauded the law, blessed by the Parliament last year, affirming that its effectiveness would help in maintaining security and stability of the country.

The National Assembly approved, on January 27th, last year, the law which in part stipulated that possession of unlicensed military ordnance is punishable with five years in prison, along with a KD 10,000 fine, or one of the two penalties.

Those who engage in trades or hold connections with terrorist cells for making arms transactions are punished with 10 years behind bars and a KD 50,000 fine. The law in its sixth article essentially stipulates amnesty for those who hand over their unlicensed guns within four months, effective the date of publishing law in the official gazette. —KUNA

CONFERENCE HELPS RESOLVE CONFLICTS IN INT'L ECONOMIC ISSUES: MINISTER

KUWAIT: The Ministry of Justice, in collaboration with the international Permanent Court Of Arbitration (PCA) at The Hague, held the fourth conference on arbitration yesterday at the Regency Hotel. Minister of Justice, Minister of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs Yaqoub Al-Sane said the conference will review the opinions and experiences of regional and international legal experts. "The importance of the conference lies in how we can resolve conflict in international economic issues," he said. "Arbitration is considered one of the most important mechanisms in the field of international investment as it meets the requirements of international trade and achievement," he said.

Sane also highlighted the importance of arbitra-

tion in the field of investment in terms of trade for faster economic growth, pointing to the necessity of activating ways of judicial facilitation in resolving conflicts related to trade and economic domain disputes, especially with their wide range of effects and implications on the global and regional economies. Sane added that the International Court of Arbitration is keen to open branches in countries around the world, and soon there will be an agreement between Kuwait and the court to open a branch in Kuwait for the GCC countries and the region.

Continuous development

Ali Thunayyan Al-Ghanem, Chairman of the Kuwait Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KCCI), said: "There is no doubt that this arbitration conference will resolve disputes by continuous development, and the KCCI is keen to participate in the organization of this conference to provide an opportunity for professionals and experts to meet and share their experiences with each other, leading to recommendations for the development of continuous techniques and methods of investment."

The two-day conference will discuss several suggestions during seven workshops about the framework of international arbitration in investment and review the most prominent international conventions, such as the Washington Agreement which established the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes, the Geneva Convention, and the convention for settlement of investment disputes within the framework of the Economic Unity Council.

MINISTER SAYS COMMITTED TO FOLLOWING COURT ORDER ON TEACHERS' ALLOWANCES

KUWAIT: The Ministry of Education is committed to following a court order which grants female expatriate teachers an equal rent allowance compared to their male counterparts, Minister Dr Bader Al-Essa said yesterday.

The government has recently issued a decision to amend the residence allowance of female expatriate teachers to become KD 150 instead of KD 60, and pay them retroactively starting from April 1, 2011. The decision is an implementation

of a constitutional court's ruling which renders the disparity of allowance pay between male and female teachers unconstitutional.

"We are committed to implementing court orders," said Essa, who is also the state's Minister of Higher Education, during a national festival organized by Kuwait University and titled 'Kuwait: between the past and present.'

Implementing the decision retroactively means each female teacher would get around KD 6,000, while a budget of around KD 40 million would have to be allocated to pay nearly 14,000

teachers in total. Meanwhile, the ministry's Assistant Undersecretary for Financial Affairs Yousuf Al-Najjar was quoted by the press yesterday as saying that the ministry cannot pay the allowances unless the Finance Ministry approves an expansion to the budget allocated for teachers' allowances.

Several lawmakers had criticized the timing of the decision, coming at a time in which the government has taken austerity measures which MPs' say have affected Kuwaitis' privileges including allocations of the treatment overseas program.

YOUNG ENTREPRENEURS TALK ON TURNING SMALL PROJECTS INTO SUCCESSFUL BUSINESSES

KUWAIT: The Kuwait Economic Society held a symposium on 'How small Kuwait projects turned into giant ones' at its premises on Tuesday. During this event, two young Kuwaiti entrepreneurs spoke about their success stories and how they turned their small projects into successful businesses.

Rakan Al-Fadhala, founding partner of Chocolateness, shared his success story of shifting from a home kitchen to a successful bakery. "I started with selling one kind of chocolate cake made at home in a stall at a university festival for KD 1. I sold 400 cakes in two days, which made me KD 400, and this was a great success for me as I was still a student, although it may be a small amount for the economy. It was a motivation for me to start my project," he noted.

'Just for fun'

Fadhala's project had three stages. "The first stage was 'just for fun,' selling at the stall at the university in 2008. In my second participation in the same university event, I sold 800 cakes, and the third time I sold 1,000 cakes. After this unexpected success and high demand by students for my cakes, I started a home-based business and delivered to customers, which was the second phase of my project," he explained.

In 2009, he hired his first driver and launched his first branch. "Before launching my first shop, I faced many problems. The first was the condition of KD 15,000 as capital to establish my project, so I worked from home till 2011 till I collected the sum for the license. With this capital, we launched our first shop in July 2011. I used the services of 37 young Kuwaiti entrepreneurs to launch my shop from A to Z. Only the wall paint was from a company," Fadhala said.

More achievements followed. "Today, Chocolateness has six branches in all Kuwait's governorates. We also have warehouses and a small factory. And we are planning to launch branches in other GCC countries in 2017. These

results were achieved just by five years of hard work. We are not just a project, but an added value to the community. We have founded a center for social responsibility that provides many services to the community including preserving the environment, supporting students' projects, courses and symposiums and sports activities for free," Fadhala said. He also spoke about an initiative he is working on to make Kuwait a 'food capital'.

Start from starch

Abdulwahab Al-Essa, Manager of OMedia, is another success story, who set up from scratch a business worth hundreds of thousands of dinars. "I worked as a TV presenter presenting political programs. At that time, I was using social media, particularly Twitter, as most people did in 2009, and people were bothering me with demands to post their news. One time, I posted a sentence about a football match and I received about a million insults of the other team, so I decided to take revenge and exploit Twitter to set up a business, and I did. I came up with the idea of advertising through celebrities on social media. Then I founded a company to get rid of the calls and I started to love Twitter," he pointed out.

Today he participates in most regional and local conferences and summits. "Once I noticed that when I advertised for a restaurant with a fashionista, all comments where about her makeup and outfits rather than the restaurant and the meals. So I decided to benefit from the agents of these outfits and makeup who gained from the ad without paying, and I launched a virtual online store for fashionistas. I diverted the fashion comments to the link of the website and people were only sharing restaurant experiences. Furthermore, I provided GCC-wide sales for the followers of these fashionistas, which made a great turnover for my website. I made \$1 million in the first quarter by selling the items, while Amazon made just \$200,000 in the same period, which I consider a great success,"

License plates stolen



I wrote that our country was very lucky because when Japanese cultured pearls were invented in 1928, the pearling industry in Kuwait was negatively affected and the years following 1932 were known as the 'diving setback' years. Something else proves that this country is blessed by both oil and luck. In the late 1990s, oil prices dropped to \$7 a barrel, which led to a \$5 billion deficit in 1999. However, luck revived again and oil prices jumped to \$24 and kept rising for years, during which the country

n an article published on Sept 7, 2013, I wrote that

made considerable surpluses when oil prices remained over \$100 a barrel for over eight years.

I wrote this in an article over two and a half years ago, and today, when prices have fallen to less than \$30 a barrel, experts, analysts and others came out to predict how the country would look like in the post-oil era, giving lots of pessimistic opinions. Well, the truth is that our country is full of luck and oil prices will go back to normal rates of over \$100 in less than 24 months. I say this out of political analyses, because America will not simply allow oil countries' economies to collapse, because they are the main buyers of weapons manufactured in their factories.

The US will work on reviving high oil prices in political and economic ways. However, to know how and when this will be done, one has to wait for the coming months, particularly in view of the accelerating regional tensions.

Now, after all these questions, I realized why the government failed along with some parties in the National Assembly in convincing the street with the process of stopping the squandering. By the way: Municipality and Communications Minister Essa Al-Kandari's arrival at the premises of a National Assembly candidate proves without a shadow of a doubt that we are in a country of capriciousness, because logic has it that if there was any accountability, the minister would be forced to resign because his presence means the government supports candidates at the expense of others, and it is not enough for some to act smartly by saying this is a personal act, because the minister is a public figure who belongs to a cohesive government. I advise any candidate who loses in the by-elections to accuse the government of interfering in the election process, because of the presence of the minister in the premises of a candidate, which is seen as the government's backing of this candidate. NEW AIRPORT TERMINAL TO MAKE KD 500M ANNUALLY

LANDING, TRANSIT FEES TO BE INCREASED: FOUZAN

KUWAIT: Efforts are in progress to develop Kuwait international airport and increase its capacity to meet growing traffic, as over 11 million passengers used the airport last year, civil aviation director Yousef Al-Fouzan said. Fouzan added that the new terminal would serve 25 million passengers annually and that it would increase the directorate's annual revenues fivefold to over KD 500 million.

Fouzan said that the civil aviation was also considering increasing the fees collected for landing at and using Kuwait international airport as a transit stopover in order to increase the revenues to around KD 140 million. "Planes flying through Kuwait's air space currently pay \$20, which is the cheapest fee in all GCC states as it had been set in the 1980s," he noted, explaining that the new fees would be equal to those collected in other GCC airports. He added that the backup terminal that would serve 5 million passengers would act as an overflow terminal in high seasons due to overcrowd-

ing because the current terminal is now serving twice as much as its capacity.

Fouzan said that the total aviation and travel companies operating in Kuwait and supervised and inspected by Civil Aviation number 676. "This requires a great deal of work to monitor their operation and receive complaints and take proper measures that may go as far as closure," he explained. —Al-Qabas

MINISTER INQUIRES ON CASES AGAINST **UNKNOWN PERSONS**

KUWAIT: An informed security source said Interior Minister Sheikh Mohammad Al-Khaled Al-Sabah expressed disappointment over statistics issued by the research and studies center which revealed that security departments recorded 12,000 cases out of 32,000 cases against unidentified perpetrators in 2014, which is equal to 48 percent of the total cases. The source said Sheikh Mohammad asked security sectors to determine the reasons for the rise in crimes registered against unidentified perpetrators, and not arresting the suspects.

The source said the minister received an answer on the reason why crimes against unidentified perpetrators are on the rise, saying there are many crimes of lesser importance registered against unknowns that do not affect the security situation, and some of them are related to private disputes or regarding financial issues, but as for important cases, stats show that the arrest percentage is on the rise.

The source said investigations is some thefts registered against unidentified perpetrators shows victims' negligence, as they behave in a way that encourages thieves to commit crimes, by leaving things such as wallets or mobile phones in the car that are visible, or leaving the car running while going into a store. The source said the majority of those arrested are juveniles, unemployed people, exconvicts and drugs addicts who usually commit robberies to get money to buy their daily needs. —Al-Qabas



PROLIFIC EGYPTIAN POLITICAL WRITER HEIKAL DIES

DESCRIBED AS 'THE NATION'S AUTHENTIC MEMORY'

CAIRO: Mohamed Heikal, a close confidant of Egypt's nationalist leader Gamal Abdel Nasser since the 1950s and later author of insider accounts of his country's wars and peacemaking with Israel, has died. He was 92.

State television said Heikal, whose health rapidly deteriorated at the start of the year, died yesterday in Cairo. Better known among Egyptians by his full name, Mohamed Hassanein Heikal, he recently suffered kidney problems that required regular dialysis. The popular author rose to prominence as a confidant and later a Cabinet minister under Nasser, Egypt's socialist and Arab nationalist president who ruled from 1954 until his sudden death in 1970.

en death in 1970. His close friendship with Nasser cast Heikal in the role of a top authority on Egyptian and regional politics at a time when much of the Arab world was shaking off colonial European rule and embroiled in armed conflict with Israel.

The leftist Nasserist ideology, which centered around what Nasser called "Arab-socialism," commands little influence in present-day Egyptian politics, but Heikal remained relevant long after Nasser died, respected for his wide network of international contacts and extraordinary analytical skills. Career diplomat Mustafa el-Fiqi described Heikal as "the nation's authentic memory." During his years as editor-in-chief of Cairo's Al-Ahram daily, Heikal tampered Egyptians' distrust of the country's tightly controlled state media under Nasser with his insider's take on the coun-

try and the region in his eagerly awaited Friday column entitled "Frankly." The column, closely followed across the Arab world, became known for Heikal's "literary journalism," a writing style emulated to this day by some of his proteges.

'Magnificent style'

Egyptian President Abdel-Fattah el-Sisi eulogized Heikal in a statement, saying the late author "established a distinctive journalistic school that combined political analysis with a magnificent writing style." Heikal's critics, however, often accused him of being an "apologist" for Nasser's authoritarian style and restrictions on individual freedoms, as well as for Egypt's humiliating defeat in the 1967 war with Israel.

Nasser's successor, Anwar Sadat, sidelined Heikal shortly after he took office in 1970, removing him from Al-Ahram in 1974, though he offered him the post of presidential adviser, which Heikal declined. A decade later, in 1981, Sadat jailed him along with hundreds of government critics just a month before the US-backed president was assassinated by Islamic militants. His successor, Hosni Mubarak, released Heikal and the others but kept the author at arm's length throughout his 29 years

Heikal, who published about 40 books, passed a damning judgment on Sadat's 11 years in power in his 1983 book "Autumn of Fury, The Assassination of Sadat." His sharply critical views of Mubarak were evident in his Arabic-language

book - "Mubarak and his age" - published in 2012, a year after Mubarak was ousted in a popular uprising. Despite his poor health, Heikal was frequently on TV in the past few years, sharing his political views in lengthy interviews, first on Qatar's Al-Jazeera network and more recently on the privately owned Egyptian network CBC. Heikal is survived by three sons: Ali, Ahmed and Hassan. Later yesterday, Heikal's body was taken to Cairo's landmark Al-Hussein mosque in the city's historic medieval district, where a prayer for the dead was held. He was later buried at the "House of Return"the name his family has given to its private burial ground on the eastern edge of Cairo. Muslims swiftly bury their dead in accordance with their faith's teachings. — AP

TURK COP ON TRIAL FOR KILLING WOMAN IN 'ANTI-TERROR' RAID

ISTANBUL: An Istanbul policeman went lished harrowing footage of the on trial yesterday charged with shooting dead a 25-year-old Turkish woman suspected of links to far-left activists during an "anti-terror" raid in the city. Prosecutors have asked for 26.5 years jail for the officer, named only as Y.M., over the killing of Dilek Dogan in the raid on her family home in the Sariyer district on October 18.

She died of her wounds in hospital on October 25. Turkish media later pub-

moment her family realized she had been shot. The case has won huge resonance with the police under scrutiny over allegedly heavy-handed tactics employed in a massive crackdown against Islamist, Kurdish and Marxist militant groups.

The trial got underway amid a heavy security presence at the Istanbul courthouse with Dilek Dogan's mother, father and brother all present, the DHA news

detained when police used water cannon to break up a group of supporters of the family who sought to enter the courthouse without authorization, reports added.

Dogan's parents have claimed their daughter is an innocent victim and so far no concrete evidence has been put forward linking her to attacks. They say she was killed after the policeman drew his weapon when she yelled at the anti-

agency said. At least 22 people were terror squad to put on overshoes so as to not dirty the floor.

The police have said the gun was fired in a scuffle after the family tried to snatch it away. Media reports have said the authorities suspected her of membership in the Revolutionary People's Liberation Party-Front (DHKP-C), links to gun attack on the US consulate in Istanbul and possible involvement in

The authorities have been cracking down on the DHKP-C, which has staged a sporadic series of attacks in Turkey in the last years, as part of a broad anti-terror operation also aimed at Islamic State (IS) and Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) members. Turkish media reports Tuesday also said a separate investigation had been launched against her father Metin, her mother Aysel and her brother Mehmet on accusations of impeding the police officers in their work during the raid. —AFP

14 DEAD IN ADEN IS SUICIDE BOMBING

ADEN: A suicide bomber killed at least 14 soldiers in Aden yesterday, in the latest attack on Yemen's second city claimed by jihadists of the Islamic State group. The southern port city has been the headquarters of forces loyal to President Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi and his backers in a Saudiled military coalition but has seen growing violence by IS and its jihadist rival Al-

"A man detonated his explosive vest among soldiers," a military source said. The troops were attending a training session run by Sudanese forces of the Saudi-led coalition, another military source said. The bomber, who was disquised as a soldier, attacked the Ras Abbas camp in the west of Aden. After the attack, panicking soldiers grabbed their weapons and fled the camp, witnesses said. The little-known "Aden and Abyan Province" branch of IS said the suicide bombing was carried out by one of its militants and alleged it killed 20 "apostate" soldiers. It came a day after Al-Qaeda claimed an attack on the convoy of Aden's governor and police chief in which four jihadists were killed.

Since March last year, when the Saudiled coalition intervened in support of Hadi, IS has ramped up its operations in Yemen. Its rival Al-Qaeda also has a significant presence in the south and southeast. In October, IS claimed its first attacks in Adena series of bombings that targeted the government's temporary headquarters and two military camps run by the coalition in which 15 people were killed.

Coalition forces have been training progovernment militiamen whom Hadi merged into the army after they drove Iranbacked rebels out of Aden and other southern provinces last year. The United Nations says more than 6,100 people have been killed and 29,000 wounded since the coalition began its intervention, about half of them civilians. —AFP

CHAOTIC MIX OF ACTORS, INTERESTS IN SYRIA WAR

PARIS: Syria's brutal five-year war has turned increasingly messy, threatening a broader regional conflict as a tangle of internal and external players push their own multi-faceted agendas. Who are the key foreign actors and what are their goals?

Assad's allies

Russia and Iran are the major backers of Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad. Their ultimate objectives differ, but both appear determined to annihilate the opposition and keep the regime in power. Syria is a key foothold for Russia in the Middle East, an important military staging post from which to project influence across the region. Analysts say Moscow is not necessarily wedded to keeping Assad in power in the long term, but wants to ensure control over

any future political transition. Russia launched its own air strikes in Syria in September to support Assad and fight "terrorists", saying it was targeting the Islamic State group and other jihadists. But the West has accused Moscow of seeking to eliminate all opposition rebels, including

more moderate groups. The Russian-backed regime assaults on rebel bastions in the northern city of Aleppo that began on February 1 have shifted the momentum decidedly in Assad's-and Moscow's-favor. Advances by regime forces have seen indiscriminate bombing of civilian areas, killing hundreds of people and causing some 50,000 to flee

Tehran has also sent thousands of "military advisors" to Syria, including Shiite militias and members of its Lebanon-based proxy force, Hezbollah. Assad has long been a close ally of Iran as part of its battle for regional dominance against the leading Sunni power, Saudi Arabia.

Rebel supporters

The countries backing the opposition are fractured, often finding themselves at odds even with their allies. Russia's bulldozer approach to the conflict has caught the West off guard, undermined its repeated calls for a political solution and triggered a virulent reaction from the leading supporters of the rebels-Turkey and Saudi Arabia. The war of words has escalated between Moscow and Ankara, already at daggers-drawn since Turkey shot down a Russian fighter jet on the border in November. The West fears the consequences of further aggression between Russia and Turkey-a NATO member which boasts the alliance's largest military force after the United States.

Turkey-once a friend of Assad-now vehemently opposes the Damascus regime, and analysts say it initially saw the conflict as an opportunity to extend Ankara's influence south. But Turkey is now hosting 2.6 million Syrian refugees and trying to keep security in a border region where IS jihadists are active.

Turkey has long rejected claims of aiding IS, which has now carried out string of attacks on its soil. But it is also increasingly concerned by the growing influence of Kurdish fighters in Syria, fearing they are seeking to carve out an autonomous region on Turkey's border and embolden the homegrown rebel Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK). It has carried out air strikes on the Syrian Kurdish militias, even though they are backed by the West as one of the few forces capable of tackling IS.

Saudi, US and France

Officially, Saudi Arabia's main concern has been IS, saying it will increase its air strikes against the jihadists. However, analysts say Riyadh is primarily interested in supporting opposition rebels as part of its regional competition with Iran, which has

also seen it battle Iranian proxies in Yemen. While, US forces have been bombing Islamic State positions in Iraq and Syria since September 2014, carrying out the vast majority of strikes by the anti-IS coalition. But despite repeatedly calling for Assad to step down, President Barack Obama has been reluctant to directly back the "moderate" opposition rebels. Having been elected in 2008 on a mandate to pull US forces out of Iraq, he has been unwilling to involve the country in another grinding war in the Middle East even when Assad was shown to have crossed Obama's supposed "red line" of using chemical weapons

Washington's efforts to train and equip a "moderate" rebel force to take on IS was a spectacular failure in 2015. It struggled to find recruits among the opposition, whose primary concern was fighting Assad, and its first fighters were almost immediately intercepted and disarmed by jihadists, leading to the scrapping of the \$500 million program in October. The United States has continued to press for dialogue and a political transition, but its critics say this has allowed Russia to seize the momentum with its more ruthless military aggression.

France has been one of the most hostile opponents of Assad, and following the jihadist attacks in Paris in November it has stepped up air strikes against IS. However, France lacks the military or diplomatic clout to direct Western actions. Outgoing foreign minister Laurent Fabius bemoaned Washington's lack of commitment to the rebel cause when he resigned last week, but his government finds itself powerless to alter the dynamics of the conflict. — AFP

Syria aid deliveries due in 'TEST' FOR WARRING SIDES

Prospects for ceasefire continues to fade

DAMASCUS: Convoys were to deliver aid to thousands of besieged Syrians yesterday in what the United Nations has described as a test for the country's warring sides ahead of a hoped-for ceasefire. The UN announced the planned deliveries late on Tuesday, as its envoy Staffan de Mistura held talks in Damascus aimed at restoring hope for a "cessation of hostilities" world powers want in place by Friday.

Prospects for the ceasefire-announced by top diplomats in Munich last week-have been fading as violence continues to shake Syria, including strikes on hospitals on Monday and repeated Turkish shelling of Kurdish militia. The Syrian Red Crescent said about 100 trucks carrying flour, other food supplies and medicines were to leave for five besieged areas yesterday. About 20 trucks had departed for Fuaa and Kafraya, two Shiite towns in northwestern Idlib province besieged by rebels, the Red Crescent said. About 40 trucks were due to depart later for Moadimayet Al-Sham, a rebel-held town near Damascus encircled by President Bashar Al-Assad's forces, Muhannad Al-Asadi of the Red Crescent said. Another 35 vehicles were to travel to Madava and Zabadani, two other regime-besieged towns near Damascus, he said. An AFP journalist in Damascus saw nearly 20 trucks ready to depart for Madaya and Zabadani from outside UN offices in the Syrian capital, with about two dozen Red Crescent volunteers on hand. Almost half a million people in Syria are in areas under siege, according to the UN. Aid workers sav several dozen people have died of starvation just in Madaya, which became a symbol of the plight of besieged Syrians after shocking images of starving residents spread last month.

'Duty' to allow aid

"It is the duty of the government of Syria to want to reach every Syrian person wherever they are and allow the UN to bring humanitarian aid," De Mistura said on Tuesday in Damascus. "Tomorrow we test this," he said. A Syrian foreign ministry source rejected talk of a test.

"We don't need anyone to remind us of our duties to our people," the source told the official SANA news agency. Diplomats have been pressing the ceasefire deal as a step forward in efforts to end the nearly five-year conflict that has left more than 260,000 dead, devastated the country and forced millions from their homes.

A major international push to resolve the conflict, including Western and Arab nations that have largely backed Syria's opposition and Assad's key supporters Russia and Iran, was launched last year. But peace talks between the regime and opposition in Geneva quickly collapsed earlier this month and a major regime offensive, backed by Russian air strikes, has continued in northern Aleppo province.

Air strikes on five medical facilities and two schools in northern Syria earlier this week killed at least 50 people, the UN said. One of the strikes hit a hospital supported by charity Doctors Without Borders (MSF), killing 25 people and prompting widespread condemnation.

MSF did not assign blame for the attack though a Britain-based monitoring group, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, said a suspected Russian strike had hit the hospital. Moscow rejected any responsibility and Syria's UN envoy Bashar Al-Jaafari on Tuesday said MSF was responsible because it was not coordinating with the government.

Turkey warns Kurds

The situation in Syria has also been complicated by Turkey's launching this week of an assault on Kurdish forces who have been advancing in northern Syria. Ankara has shelled a Kurdish-led militia which it says is allied with the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) that has waged an insurgency on its soil for decades.

President Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday vowed Turkey would never accept the creation of a Kurdish stronghold in northern Syria, saying there was "no question" of Turkey ending its shelling. "We will not allow a new Qandil on our southern border", Erdogan said in a televised speech, referring to the mountain range in northern Iraq which for years has been stronghold of PKK militants. Turkey on Tuesday called for foreign ground forces to deploy in Syria, part

of a longstanding push by the NATO member for a more robust response to the conflict. Yesterday Deputy Prime Minister Yalcin Akdogan told A Haber television Ankara wanted to create a 10-kilometre "safe line" inside Syria that would include the flashpoint town of Azaz near the border. Turkey has long pressed for a safe zone, backed up by a no-fly zone, inside Syria and has warned Kurdish forces it will not allow them to seize Azaz, which is held by rebel forces. German Chancellor Angela Merkel yesterday also reiterated her call for a no-fly zone to protect civilians, saying the humanitarian situation in Syria was "intolerable". "If we were able to reach an agreement between anti- and pro-Assad forces on a kind of no-fly zone... then this would save many lives and aid the political process about Syria's future," she told the German parliament. —AFP

ERDOGAN VOWS 'TO' DENY KURD STRONGHOLD IN NORTHERN SYRIA

ANKARA: President Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday vowed Turkey would not allow the creation of a Kurdish stronghold in northern Syria, saying there was no question of Turkish forces stopping their bombardment of Syrian Kurdish fighters.

"We will not allow a new Qandil on our southern border" with Syria, Erdogan said in a televised speech in Ankara, referring to the mountain in northern Iraq which for years has been stronghold of Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) militants. "They (the West) tell us to stop shelling" the Kurdish fighters in Syria, Erdogan said after Turkey hit their positions for the last four days in

"Forgive me, but there is no question of us doing such a thing. Whoever fires shells on Turkey will get not just a tit-for-tat response but an even greater one," he added. Erdogan renewed his assault on the United States, which supports the Syrian Kurdish Democratic Union Party (PYD) and its People's Protection Units (YPG) militia as the best fighting force on the ground against Islamic State (IS) jihadists. "The fact that the United States is continuing

to support the YPG is something I find hard to understand," said Erdogan. "Aren't we NATO allies?" he said, addressing Washington. "Are you our friend or the friend of the PYD?" "We know that we need friends. But if you don't see us as friends then please say it loud and clear."

Washington recognizes the PKK as a terror group but not the PYD and YPG. But Erdogan said the links between the PKK and PYD were as tight as those between Al-Qaeda and its affiliate Al-Nusra Front. Erdogan said that Turkey would "not allow... the provocative" steps taken by the Syrian Kurds in the northern Aleppo province where their advance has greatly alarmed Turkey.

Turkey fears the Syrian Kurds want to carve out a continuous autonomous region in northern Syria stretching from the Iraqi border almost to the Mediterranean. Ankara also accuses the PYD of becoming a proxy of its regional foe Russia and working specifically to harm Turkish interests.— AFP

HEAT BRINGS OUT BEACHGOERS AS OTHER REGIONS CLEAN UP

SAN DIEGO: John Larson sat on a blanket on a Southern California beach, furiously posting videos on Facebook of his sons jumping in the waves and bracing for the expletives from friends in Buffalo, New York. It was 5 below zero when Larson and his sons left this weekend for their trip to San Diego, where a heat wave sent temperatures into the mid-80s on Tuesday.

"Oh yeah, they hate me," the 51-year-old graphic designer said of the response he got to his beach posts. "I get quotes like, 'Jerk!" Beaches in Southern California were crowded after the holiday weekend saw record-breaking heat from Los Angeles to San Diego, while the East Coast and the South cleaned up from a deep freeze and tornadoes.

It was even hotter in Phoenix: Tuesday's high topped out at 87 degrees, which broke the previous record of 84 set in 2014. The National Weather Service is forecasting a high of 90 degrees in what would be the earliest 90-degree day on record for the desert city.

High-pressure system

The normal temperature for this time of year is in the 70s. The previous mark was set on Feb 24, 1986. Phoenix also saw record highs last week as an unusually strong high-pressure system lingered. The surge in temperatures has been bringing rattlesnakes out of hibernation. A fire agency in southern Arizona started getting calls in the last two weeks from panicked residents about the poisonous snakes on their yards and patios, something they don't usually see until late March and early April.

Millions along the East Coast, meanwhile, were still shivering from freezing temperatures. A treacherous mix of snow, sleet and freezing rain caused car crashes from the Mid-Atlantic states through Pennsylvania to northern New England on Tuesday, a day after twisters tore through parts of the South.

At least three deaths were reported on slick roads, all in Virginia, and thousands were left without power from weather-caused outages. Down South, people combed through the

wreckage after a big storm system turned several homes to rubble Monday in the northwest corner of Florida's Panhandle and in Mississippi. More than a dozen homes were destroyed in both states, but there were no immediate reports of deaths or serious injuries, authorities

In the Pacific Northwest, a President's Day storm brought record rainfall and sent rivers overflowing their banks in Washington state. The weather woes nationwide were no problem for Larson in sunny Southern California. He has five more days here and is in no hurry to get home to Buffalo, where extra crews removed overnight snowfall and accumulations could reach up to 18 inches in some parts of the region, the weather service said.

He's soaking up the sun with his sons, ages 11 and 17, since the unseasonable heat is expected to dissipate. California's warmth was likely to end overnight when a low-pressure system brings rain to a large part of the state and snow of up to 2 feet to the mountains. — AP

SCALIA DEATH PHONE INQUEST UNUSUAL BUT PRECEDENTIAL

MARFA: A county judge's determination via telephone that Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia died of natural causes and required no autopsy was unusual, Texas officials said, but sometimes happens in rural areas of Texas where a county can be bigger than some US states.

Within two hours of Scalia's body being found Saturday at Cibolo Creek Ranch in remote West Texas, Presidio county Judge Cinderela Guevara, who was 60 miles away, consulted by phone with the county sheriff and a US marshal and concluded there was no foul play. After speaking to Scalia's personal doctor later that evening, she decided that he had died of natural causes and no autopsy was necessary.

"I have no issue with how she handled his death," said David Beebe, a justice of the peace in Presidio County, where Scalia died. Beebe is one of two justices of the peace in the county who are routinely called by authorities to verify a death. Both Beebe and the second justice of the peace were out of town Saturday. Presidio County Sheriff Danny Dominguez, in need of a justice to conduct a death inquest, then called Guevara, who offered to hear the matter.

In rural areas, a justice of the peace typically makes the determination of the cause of death in cases when no witnesses were present. An inquest by phone is as valid as one in person under state law, said Bronson

Tucker, an attorney for the Texas Justice Courts Training Center who offers instruction to justices of the peace.

No red flags

"The huge majority of the time, if you have a 79-year-old overweight person and you have a statement from the physician and zero indicators of foul play, then it's not unusual for there to be no autopsy," said Tucker. "I didn't see any red flags and nothing to say that the judge didn't follow her statutory obligation."

Guevara issued a statement Tuesday defending how she handled the inquest. She said the attorney for Scalia told her the family did not want an autopsy performed because they believe he died of natural causes and they preferred not to delay his body's return to them. Guevara said she consulted with Scalia's physician and the sheriff before deciding against an autopsy.

"I respected the wishes of the Scalia family. ... I did this based on credible reports to me from law enforcement and from Justice Scalia's personal physician," Guevara said. Susana Gonzales, a justice of the peace in adjacent Brewster County, said she's never done an inquest by phone but understands there may be situations where it's necessary. "There's not a procedural mechanism to challenge or appeal the determination by the justice of the peace,"Tucker said. —AP

OBAMA SAYS TRUMP WILL NOT BE ELECTED

NORTH AUGUSTA: Donald Trump pushed back Tuesday against his rivals for the Republican nomination and criticism from President Barack Obama, as the real estate mogul sought to cement victory in South Carolina.

With just four days until the state's crucial primary, Trump became yet again the focus of attacks by challengers to his frontrunner status, including his nearest adversary Ted Cruz who blasted the businessman turned reality TV star as a liberal. He also traded political punches with Marco Rubio and Jeb Bush and laid out attack lines ahead of the crucial primary, the third in the long party nominations races and the first in the US South

While Trump was busy scrapping with rivals, Democrat Obama joined the fray, offering a scathing assessment of why he thinks the American people will not elect the . "I continue to believe that Mr Trump will not be president. And the reason is because I have a lot of faith in the American people. And I think they recognize that being president is a serious job," he told reporters in California.

"It's not hosting a talk show or a reality show. It's not promotion. It's not marketing. It's hard," he said on the sidelines of a summit with leaders and representatives. Trump, 69, reacted with scorn. "This man has done such a bad job, he has set us back so far," Trump said in a television interview, adding however that in a way, being singled out-even for reproach-by the sitting US president was "a great compliment." Cruz, a first-term senator from Texas, piled on Trump during a rally in Anderson. Clearly speaking of Trump, Cruz called on Americans not to nominate and elect a Republican who has "defended abortion or partial birth abortion for the first 60 years of his life." The controversial billionaire for his part played up his international business acumen at a rally in North Augusta ahead of Saturday's primary.

'Why aren't they beating me?'

Trump leads handily in South Carolina, with a new CNN poll showing him with 38 percent support over arch-conservative Cruz, who has 22 percent. The 16-point spread is down from the 20-point RealClearPolitics average, suggesting a softening in some support after Saturday's bruising debate slugfest. "Why aren't they beating me?" Trump taunted, to loud cheers.

Even with his commanding lead, he was calling on supporters to crowd the polls. "Assume that we're behind, because you've gotta go vote," Trump said. Cruz highlighted his experience with Constitutional law in dwelling on a Saturday event that hit the political landscape like an earthquake: the death of conservative Supreme Court justice Antonin Scalia.


Cruz has joined other Republican candidates in insisting that no nominee to replace Scalia be confirmed by the Senate until there is a new president next January. "We are one justice away from losing our fundamental liberties," he said, underscoring the stakes of the election as conservatives see the appointment of a liberal judge as potentially ending conservative efforts to overturn landmark cases on abortion, health care and immigration.

Bush, riding high a day after his brother and former president George W Bush hit the campaign trail with Jeb for the first time, caused an earthquake of his own Tuesday. Seeking to present himself as the candidate most capable of rebuilding the military, Bush visited a gun manufacturer in state capital Columbia, where he spoke to company employees and walked away with his own personally engraved hand gun.

He tweeted a photograph of the firearm afterwards, with a single word of commentary: "America." Bush is the consummate establishment candidate, the son and brother of two presidents. But Trump's ascension has upended the race, and forced Bush into underdog status. Trump supporter Jennifer Twilley, reflecting on the anger and frustration coursing through the US electorate, said Trump's status as a magnate and political outsider made him ideal for the job.—AFP

MERKEL URGES EU COMMON STANCE IN REFUGEE CRISIS

BERLIN: German Chancellor Angela Merkel yesterday urged an EU "common stance" on the migrant crisis and on protecting the bloc's frontiers, as eastern members move to shut internal borders. On the eve of an EU summit, Merkel said "the main thing now is to have a common stance on how to secure the external borders, and here the EU-Turkey plan offers a good solution".

Merkel, under heavy pressure at home to reduce arrivals, supports a plan under which transit country Turkey would seal its borders and then fly refugees to Europe where they would be settled under an EU quota system. However, most EU countries have shown little enthusiasm for the idea, and the so-called Visegrad Four-Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Hungary — have openly defied Merkel.

DEMOGRAPHY VS ECONOMY AS UGANDA HEADS TO THE POLLS

KAMPALA: Labyrinthine and cacophonous, Kampala's sprawling Owino Market is private enterprise unchained, a place where Ugandans struggle daily to survive and thrive. And after three decades of President Yoweri Museveni's rule, his election promise of jobs and wealth rings hollow to many here. Francis Ssendawula is a trained schoolteacher, but after failing to find work he moved into the informal sector and is now the proprietor of a wardrobe-sized second-hand shoe store on one of Owino's narrow mud alleys.

"We need the chance to participate in our national cake," said the 29-year old who, like many of the capital's urban youth, will vote for opposition candidate Kizza Besigye in Thursday's polls. Ssendawula has little time for Museveni's election promises. "You should not mind about more jobs with this government," he said. Instead Ssendawula has made a job for himself, selling his stock of shoes designer knockoffs imported from China-in the hope of earning enough to make a living and perhaps start a family.

"On a good day I can make something like 50,000 (Uganda shillings, \$15, 13 Euros), but other days no coin," he said with a shrug. Since seizing power in 1986 Museveni has emphasized peace and stability, contrasting his rule to the preceding decades of strife and civil war under Idi Amin and Milton Obote.

'Make jobs for ourselves'

The dominant political narrative portrays Museveni as the guarantor of peace and bulwark against chaos-and it has been effectively drummed home. "Stability is the catalyst for everything else," said Levis Nuwemanzi, a clean-cut 33-year old.

"Where Uganda is and where Uganda is going, we are not doing bad," said Nuwemanzi, who studied economics at university and now sells jeans and shirts in Owino. "Progress isn't a boom thing, it is continuous, gradual," he said echoing the president's campaign slogan, 'Steady Progress'. A short way up the same tight, tarp-roofed corridor a barrel-chested former security guard, Eddy Mupere, said the lack of economic opportunities meant it was time for a change.

"The government has not created jobs for people! We make jobs for ourselves," said the 38-year old, who has sold secondhand T-shirts here for a dozen years. "The government has done nothing, completely. That's why some guys have degrees and yet they are working

"We have got bad leadership and that means a bad economy." Uganda has not crashed, but nor has it taken off. Foreign companies have found billions of barrels of oil beneath Lake Albert, yet none of the thick crude has been extracted. The economy is growing at more than five percent a year but remains dependent on exports of agricultural products such as coffee, tobacco, fish and tea. Inflation is below eight percent. But demographics are against the country, and Uganda is failing to supply the jobs that its youthful, fast-growing population needs. More than half of Uganda's 39 million people are under 16, with estimates of the proportion of jobless as high as four out of five. With population growing at a staggering pace, Uganda is predicted to reach 100 million by mid-century.

Peace is not enough

Fred Muhumuza, an economist and former finance ministry advisor, blamed Uganda's five-year election cycle, patronage politics and mismanagement for the economic stagnation. "Talk of oil has been on for 10 years now: no progress. We talk of railways: no progress. All these five-year plans, you might as well just change the dates. That is a great failure," he said. Muhumuza was impressed with Museveni's first decade but the advent of competitive elections in 1996 meant, "populism took over and development became secondary." Patronage politics-the purchase of support in parliament and among the peopletook centre stage and, "You don't build effectiveness through patronage," he said.

After 30 years in power and a series of electoral victories, Museveni and his National Resistance Movement (NRM) party are complacent. "The government is so comfortable, it has relaxed," said Muhumuza. Far less comfortable are ordinary folk like Benon Muyomba, a 32-year-old self-employed driver of a motorbike taxi, or boda-boda. Five years ago Muyomba took a \$580 (520 Euros) loan to buy his first motorbike, starting a business that can pay much better than formal employment: as much as \$9 (8 Euros) on a good day, versus the \$26 (18 Euros) a month he used to earn as a hotel bellboy.

"We are happy with the peace that we have - but it's not enough," said Muyomba, a Besigye supporter, who says successive governments are failing to provide the basics of healthcare, education and employment. "As long as those are there we thing else," he said. — AFP

MUGABE'S EX-DEPUTY SETS UP RIVAL ZIMBABWE PARTY

HARARE: Zimbabwean former vice president Joice Mujuru announced yesterday that she had founded a new party to challenge President Robert Mugabe's all-powerful ZANU-PF, in a move that could shake up the country's politics. Mugabe, who turns 92 on Sunday, has ruled since independence in 1980 during an era marked by vote-rigging, mass emigration, accusations of human rights abuses and economic decline.

He is expected to stand again for election in 2018, but jockeying over his succession has intensified due to his advanced age and speculation about his health. "We are 'People First," Mujuru said by telephone, confirming the name of her new party but giving no further details. "We don't lead the people, but people lead themselves." Mujuru, the widow of Zimbabwe's first post-independence army general, was fired from Mugabe's government and the ruling ZANU-PF party in December 2014. Her ousting came after a campaign by the president's wife Grace denigrating Mujuru and accusing her of corruption, fomenting party division and plotting to topple Mugabe.

Many of her allies and perceived sympathisers met a similar fate in a party purge. Mujuru, who was replaced as vice president by longtime Mugabe ally Emmerson Mnangagwa, denied all accusations of disloyalty. She enjoys some public popularity in Zimbabwe, but faces a huge task to establish her new party in the country's tense political scene. "It is a Herculean task," political analyst Takura Zhangazha said. "The party will have to be phenomenally creative to mount a serious challenge for power. "It must try to be different from not only

ZANU-PF but also from mainstream opposition parties such as the Movement for Democratic Change (MDC). "Fighting within ZANU-PF may help, but it will not be enough."

Former Mugabe favorite

Mujuru, 60, was a guerrilla fighter during Zimbabwe's 1970s liberation war before rising to become vice president in 2004. A former ZANU-PF stalwart, she served in several cabinets under Mugabe and was seen for many years as his favoured choice of successor.

Her husband, Solomon Mujuru, died in a mysterious house fire in 2011. Mujuru signaled her intention to form a rival party last year by releasing a manifesto that opposed Mugabe's key policies including indigenization laws that compel foreign firms to cede majority stakes to locals. ZANU-PF has been riven by factional fights over Mugabe's succession although party figures have sought to downplay any splits. Mnangagwa is now viewed as the likely next president, with Grace Mugabe, 50, also a possible candidate. In the 2013 presidential election, Mugabe won 61 percent of the vote against 34.9 percent recorded by Morgan Tsvangirai of the MDC. Tsyangirai described the results as "a huge farce" after campaigning and voting were marred by intimidation, violence and fraud. Western groups were not allowed to send poll observers, but the United States dismissed the result as "not a credible expression of the will of Zimbabwean people". — AFP

MIDDLE OF NOWHERE: MIGRANTS FIND FROZEN REFUGE IN NORWAY

Integrating to life 280 miles north of the Arctic

HAMMERFEST: After hiding below the horizon for two long months, the sun has finally risen in Hammerfest, casting a pale pink hue over the Arctic landscape surrounding the world's northernmost refugee shelter.

From her modest room, Huda Al-Haggar admires the wonderland of snow and ice, a sight so different from her native Yemen, where a Saudi airstrike destroyed her home, forcing her to flee with her young son. "It's wonderful when I wake up in the morning and see this picture, the sea and the mountains. It's a wonderful place," the young woman says as 5-year-old Omar plays with Lego on her lap.

The wooden barracks where Al-Haggar and her son live used to house oil workers until Europe's migrant crisis reached the jagged shores of northern Norway, where the continent drops dramatically into the Arctic Ocean. Waiting for their asylum claims to be processed, hundreds of people in emergency shelters in Hammerfest and neighboring towns are slowly getting used to the extreme climate and unfamiliar customs of the High North.

Adapting to the cold

They say they have adapted to the cold - the temperature rarely drops below minus 10 degrees C (14 F) along the coast, though it gets much colder further inland. It's the darkness that throws them off. Rami Saad, a 23-year-old Syrian from Damascus with a neatly groomed beard and tight slacks, says workers at the Hammerfest center warned him about the polar night but he didn't believe them until late November, when "suddenly there was no sun." The lack of daylight messed up his body clock, like the day when he rolled out of bed at 11 and ambled to the cafeteria to have lunch. "But there was nobody there," Saad says, giggling. "It was 11 pm" Few of the asylum-seekers expected to end up here, 280 miles north of the Arctic Circle, when they left their homelands in the Middle East, Africa and Asia to escape violence, poverty, forced marriages or armies they didn't want to join.

Some were relocated by Norwegian authorities after entering the country from Sweden in the south. Others blazed a new trail into Western Europe by first entering Russia and then crossing its Arctic border with Norway. More than 5,000 people, mostly Syrians and Afghans, used that route last year before the government tightened the border in November and started deporting those who were not deemed to be in need of protection in Norway.

Though that's just a trickle compared to the 1 million people who entered Europe last year from the south across the Mediterranean Sea, it forced Norwegian authorities to quickly set up migrant shelters in small towns separated by mile upon mile of untouched wilderness.

In Alta, a scenic two-hour drive to the south, the Northern Lights Hotel was converted into a shelter for unaccompanied minors. On Seiland Island, a nature reserve west of Hammerfest, Stig Erland Hansen was asked to temporarily house dozens of asylum-seekers in a remote lodge where he hosts adventure tourists during the summer.

People in darkness

"At first I thought it was crazy," Hansen says, clasping a cup of black coffee inside the main cabin. "Is it possible to have people in darkness on an island?" Not only was it possible, it was a big success, according to Hansen and Paal Mannsverk, who manages the camp, a cluster of wooden houses facing a pristine fjord. Reachable only by boat, the isolated location gives you a sense of being at the end of the world - or as Mannsverk put it: "North of the middle of nowhere."

Yet the 36 asylum-seekers staying here, all but one from Afghanistan, seem surprisingly at ease. Hansen and Mannsverk say it's because they try to keep them active: Fishing, chopping wood, sledding, skiing, and hiking instead of just sitting around waiting for a decision by the Norwegian Immigration Directorate, which can take more than a year. The camp on Seiland is a far cry from the crowded and jail-like migrant centers in some parts of Europe. Afghan children laugh and holler as they sled down the slope from the camp to the rocky shoreline, where men speaking Dari rinse fish caught in the icy fjord. Later, as the sun drops behind the mountains, they will cook them over an open fire with onion, tomatoes, eggs and spices brought in from the mainland.

To some the contrast with the life they left behind is almost surreal. "I was in Afghanistan, a country far away from here and now I'm in the north of Norway. I could never have imagined this," says 20-year-old Zakria Sedequi. He says he fled Afghanistan's Maidan Wardak province after the Taleban tried to recruit him. An ugly scar over his left eyebrow suggests they didn't ask nicely. Sedegui says they rammed the butt of a Kalashnikov rifle into his forehead. He documented the bloody mess with his cellphone camera.

Inside the camp, 62-year-old Shukria Nawabi tears up as she recalls the hardship her family faced in Kabul. She has lived on Seiland since October with her husband, daughter and grand-daughter Helenar, a 7-year-old with pigtails, pink tights and a sheepish smile. "We escaped from enemies in our life," Nawabi says through an interpreter, declining to delve into the details. Wrapped in a shawl, her daughter, Sufya, seems almost offended when asked whether the family struggled to adjust to the darkness on this desolate island. "If you were in my place," she says, "where bombs are going off in the street, where women are treated badly, and you come to this place, would you worry about the darkness and the isolation?"

A handful of young men who were transferred to Seiland didn't see it that way. They decided this wasn't the place for them, packed up their belongings and asked to be taken ashore. Some went back to Russia, where they had been studying. A couple traveled all the way to Italy, says Mannsverk.

Integrating asylum-seekers

By the spring, the lodge will go back to its regular tourist business and the asylum-seekers will have to be transferred elsewhere, perhaps to permanent asylum centers like the one in Alta. The city of 20,000 has years of experience with integrating asylum-seekers into the local community.

The staff at the Hero asylum center in Alta try to prepare the newcomers for life in Norway by teaching them local customs, including how to treat women, a subject given particular attention after reports of mass sex assaults blamed on migrants in Germany on New Year's eve. "Norwegian women can drink alcohol and be loud just like men. This is completely normal in Norwegian society," says Ingunn Soergaard, a petite woman with waistlength hair and a crystal-white smile.

Her audience of 18 asylum-seekers, mostly from Syria, look at her with bewilderment. Not because they think it's weird that Norwegian women drink, but that Soergaard thinks they don't know that. We've seen that on TV. And we know that's how it is here. It's not an issue," says Anod Al-Ali, a 31-yearold teacher from Syria. Soergaard's co-presenter, Goeran Johansen, decides to push the issue further. "Let's say I'm meeting Ingunn for the first time and she invites me home to have sex," Johansen says. "And then suddenly at home she says, 'No, I don't want to have sex.' What do you do?" Some of the students shift awkwardly in their seats. Walaa Aziri, a 23-year-old Palestinian woman with a hijab turns bright red and hides her face in her hands.

Finally, Ahmed Dawwas, a 36-year-old engineer who fled the Syrian city of Raqqa, an Islamic State stronghold, breaks the silence by turning the question around. "What if she invites me and I say no? How should she react?" Dawwas asks. When the laughter dies down, he strikes a more serious tone. "We have come here to live in peace," he says. "We have fled war. We're not here to go after women. I don't understand why this has to be explained to all Syrians." — AP

MILLION CHILDREN MALNOURISHED IN EASTERN, SOUTHERN AFRICA: UN

JOHANNESBURG: Nearly one million children across eastern and southern Africa are suffering from "severe acute malnutrition" after two years of drought and the strongest El Nino in 50 years, UNICEF said yesterday. Children in the region face worsening food and water shortages, with rising prices exacerbating the situation as families are forced to skip meals and sell belongings. "Severe acute malnutrition" is defined as extreme hunger, causing a very low weight-for-height ratio, visible wasting or fluid retention. "The El Nino weather phenomenon will wane, but the cost to children-many who were already living hand-to-mouth-will be felt for years to come," said UNICEF regional director Leila Gharagozloo-Pakkala.

"Governments are responding with available resources, but this is an unprecedented situation. Children's survival is dependent on action taken today." The agency is running humanitarian appeals calling for \$87 million for Ethiopia, \$26 million for Angola and \$15 million for Somalia.

Lesotho, Zimbabwe, and most of South Africa have declared drought emergencies, while in Ethiopia, the number of people in need of food assistance is expected to increase from 10 million to 18 million this year. Malawi is facing its worst food crisis in nine years, with 2.8 million people (more than 15 percent of the population) at risk of hunger and "severe acute malnutrition" doubling in only two months.

"The statistics are staggering," said Megan Gilgan, UNICEF regional emergency advisor. "The situation is expected to worsen throughout this year and into 2017." Last month the UN's World Food Programme (WFP) said 14 million people across southern Africa faced going hungry after a prolonged drought wrecked harvests. The WFP said the cost of maize, also called corn, in Malawi was 73 percent higher than average. South Africa will import half its average maize crop after 2015 was declared the driest year in more than a century. In Ethiopia, 435,000 children were said to be in need of treatment for severe acute malnutrition. "We are dealing with a slow onset crisis affecting countries in different ways," Gilgan said. "The outlook is disturbing, with little or no rain falling in affected areas."

UNICEF said conditions were worse than the 2011 Horn of Africa food crisis that hit Somalia, Ethiopia, Djibouti, Kenya and Uganda. Apart from hunger, the spread of diarrhea, cholera and typhoid has also been reported. Sparked by warming in sea surface temperatures in the equatorial Pacific, El Nino periodically wreaks havoc on world weather patterns, causing drought in some parts and floods in others. — AFP







Indian child activists slam Vatican for revoking ban

NEW DELHI: Children's activists in India yesterday criticized the Vatican for revoking the suspension of a Catholic priest who was convicted by a US court of sexually abusing a minor. Indian priest Joseph Palanivel Jeyapaul, 61, was suspended by his local diocese in India five years ago after being accused of sexually abusing two girls during a posting to Minnesota.

He was later convicted of assaulting

one of them, a 16-year-old, and served time in jail. But the Vatican lifted his suspension in January following a recommendation by an Indian bishop. "The lifting of the suspension amounts to the Church condoning his actions," Ranjana Kumari, director of the Centre for Social Research, an NGO working on women's and girls' rights said.

The decision was "totally unacceptable", coming as the Vatican undertook to root out sexual abuse by the Church, she said. Jeyapaul was accused of sexually abusing two girls while serving as a priest in Crookston Diocese in Minnesota between 2004 and 2005, but one victim dropped the charges against him.

The Diocese of Ooty in southern India's Tamil Nadu state suspended him in 2010 before he was arrested by Interpol in 2012 and extradited to the US to face trial. Following a plea deal, Roseau County district court sentenced him to a year in jail but he was released and deported to India in June 2015 on account of time served while awaiting trial.

Sebastian Selvanathan, a spokesman for Ooty diocese, said that while the Vatican had lifted Jeyapaul's suspension, the priest would not return to service. "We have provided him accommodation but he will not have any active role in the Church," Selvanathan said.

The Survivors Network of Those Abused by Priests, a US group, has urged the Church to warn the public about Jeyapaul's past and expressed concern over his presence in India. "We worry now about the safety of girls in India near Fr Jeyapaul," the group said on its website. Local police said they would collect more information on the disgraced priest but said he was not under

BEIJING DEPLOYS MISSILES ON DISPUTED SOUTH SEA ISLAND

CHINA SAYS THEY HAVE RIGHT TO 'SELF-DEFENSE'

BEIJING: China has deployed surface-to-air missiles on a disputed island in the South China Sea, Taiwan said yesterday, as Beijing insisted it had a right to build "selfdefense" systems in the strategic region. Taiwan's defense ministry confirmed the facility's existence after Fox News reported missile launchers had arrived on Woody Island, part of the Paracels chain, in the past week.

The report came as President Barack Obama called for "tangible steps" to reduce tensions in the

strategically vital area and has sent warships to sail close to the disputed islands to assert that right.

Analysts said the latest deployment could be an attempt to deter such freedom of navigation operations (FONOPs). Australian military aircraft also routinely overfly the area. Fox News said Tuesday that images showed two batteries of eight missile launchers and a radar system had arrived on Woody Island, the Paracels' main island.

"The defense ministry has learned of an air defense missile has built on the islands," Wang said, "are consistent with the right to self-preservation and self-protection that China is entitled to under international law".

Raising tensions

"We discussed the need for tangible steps in the South China Sea to lower tensions," Obama said, calling for "a halt to further reclamation, new construction and militarization of disputed areas". In addition to the three Paracels claimants, the Philippines, Malaysia and Brunei have competing claims in the Spratlys.

Resentment still simmers in with its giant neighbor, and yesterday it marked the 37th anniversary of a different border clash. During a visit to Washington last year, Chinese President Xi Jinping pledged not to militarize the Spratlys, though he made no mention of the Paracels, and Medcalf said the latest move violated "the spirit, if not the letter" of that assurance. LAWYERS CLASH WITH PROTESTERS IN INDIA OVER STUDENT'S ARREST

NEW DELHI: Dozens of lawyers, many with links to India's ruling nationalist party, yesterday attacked protesters who have been demanding the release of a university student leader arrested under colonial-era sedition laws

The clashes began shortly before a court hearing for Kanhaiya Kumar, the president of the students' union at the country's premier Jawaharlal Nehru University. The left-leaning campus leader has been in prison since Friday over his participation in events where anti-India slogans were allegedly shouted.

Soon after the clashes began, a grimacing and cowering Kumar was escorted onto the court premises on foot by a few policemen. Several reports said he was punched and kicked as he was taken inside the courtroom.

About a dozen lawyers threw rocks at reporters and protesters. One of them grabbed the camera strap of an Associated Press photographer, bruising his hand and breaking his lens. At least one reporter also said that the lawyers beat him and broke his cellphone while the police watched.

The attacks and Kumar's arrest highlighted allegations of increasing of intolerance in India since Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party came to power in 2014. Kumar was arrested on a police complaint filed by a BJP-linked student faction over events where the anti-India shouts were alleged along with criticism of the 2013 secret hanging of a Kashmiri separatist convicted

of an attack on Parliament. The lawyers waved Indian flags and chanted slogans like "glory to Mother India" and "traitors leave India." Many of the lawyers seen on television footage yesterday had been involved in similar violence Monday when reporters and Kumar's supporters were beaten outside the court premises.

Political activism

The violence occurred despite the Supreme Court ordering the police to ensure security ahead of yesterday's hearing. Delhi Police chief BS Bassi said police were trying to identifying those involved in the violence, but no arrests have been made despite several newspapers naming the lawyers and publishing their photographs prominently.

India's sedition laws were drafted by its British colonial rulers to suppress the country's freedom struggle, and the Supreme Court has said in recent years the laws should be invoked only when there is actual evidence of incitement to violence.

The trouble on the campus of the prestigious university, also known for students' political activism, followed a Feb 9 event marking the anniversary of Afzal Guru's execution. Some human rights activists and most Kashmiris in the Indian-controlled portion of the region believe he was not given a fair trial. The campus dispute escalated sharply when senior government ministers got involved. The home minister, Rajnath Singh, tweeted that anyone shouting anti-India slogans "will not be tolerated or spared," and Human Resource Minister Smriti Irani told reporters that "the nation can never tolerate an insult to Mother India." Since the arrest of Kumar, the student leader, last week, students and faculty have staged sporadic protests demanding his release and accusing the government of crushing all dissenting voices. Niamkoi, a PhD student who uses just one name, said the random police questioning of students left many feeling intimidated.

Indian newspapers have published scathing editorials about the government's disproportionate response to an event on the university campus. PACQUIAO FACES VOTE BOYCOTT FOR BIGOTED GAY COMMENTS

MANILA: Gay and lesbian groups have called on voters in the Philippines to boycott boxing icon Manny Pacquiao as he bids for a Senate seat, after he described gays as "worse than animals". An online petition is also underway asking global sportswear company Nike Inc to drop Pacquiao as an endorser. The petition on change.org has garnered more than 2,000 signatures so far.

Pacquiao, revered in the Philippines for winning world boxing titles in eight different weight classes during his 20-year career, suddenly fell from grace after a 30-second inter- and transgender community for his comview on local television about same-sex marriage, which he opposes.

"It's just common sense. Do you see any animals of the same sex mating? Animals are better off, they can distinguish between male and female," Pacquiao told TV5 on Monday. "Now if men are mating with men and women with women, then they are worse than animals," he said. This is not the first time Pacquiao, a sitting two-term congressman,

had earned the ire of the lesbian, gay, bisexual

ments on same-sex marriage. He also apologized for his remarks in 2012.

Same-sex marriage is not allowed in the Philippines where more than 80 percent of the 100 million population is Roman Catholic. The 37-year old congressman, among those favored to win a Senate seat at the May elections based on independent pollsters' surveys, apologized on Tuesday. Latest surveys showed him in 8th place for the race to win 12 vacant seats in the Senate.

'Please forgive me'

"I'm sorry for hurting people by comparing homosexuals to animals. Please forgive me for those I've hurt," Pacquiao said in a video message on his Twitter account. He said he remained against same-sex marriage. That didn't stop a torrent of comments on social media lambasting Pacquiao and using the hashtags #NoToManny2016 #zerovoteformanny and #WorseThanAnimals. His Twitter followers dropped to around 11,000 yesterday from over 2 million, according to the online edition of Inquirer Radio.

"LGBT groups and individuals are saying he should not be voted into office... we are one of them," Danton Remoto, head of Philippine lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender group Ladlad, or Out, told Reuters by phone. While the former boxer's comments offended liberal Filipinos, they could have struck a chord with more conservative voters in the staunchly Catholic country. Local singer Aiza Seguerra, who married her actress-girlfriend partner in late 2014 in San Francisco, also called on voters to boycott Pacquiao. "You might've done our country proud but with your statement, you just showed the whole country why we shouldn't vote for you," Seguerra said on her Instagram. —Reuters

INDIA MEDIA MAGNATE **CHARGED WITH MURDER**

MUMBAI: One of India's leading cial dispute over property dealings media magnates has been formally charged with murder over the death of his stepdaughter, an investigating officer said yesterday, the latest development in a case gripping the

Peter Mukerjea, an ex-chief executive of media behemoth Star India, has also been charged with abduction, destruction of evidence and giving false information, an official with India's Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) said. "He has been charged with the same offences as the others," the official told AFP on condition of anonymity, referring to an earlier chargesheet filed against Mukerjea's wife and two others.

Wife Indrani Mukerjea is accused along with her driver and ex-husband of strangling Sheena Bora to death before dumping her body in a forest and setting it alight. Bora, 22, was Indrani's daughter from a previous relationship. She was murdered in April 2012 and her burnt body was discovered the following month in woods in the western state of Maharashtra, of which Mumbai is the capital. Indrani was arrested in August on suspicion of murdering the young woman, who was having an affair with Peter Mukerjea's son from an earlier marriage. Various motives have been put forward for the alleged crime, including a finanand a dislike of Bora's relationship with Peter Mukerjea's son, Rahul.

The CBI also arrested Peter Mukerjea in November and on Tuesday formally added him to the same chargesheet after several months of questioning, according to a statement on its website. Peter Mukerjea was chief executive of Foxowned Star India from 1997 to 2007 before leaving to start his own television venture and is seen as one of India's most successful media mag-

In November, the CBI formally charged Indrani, who is the prime accused, her driver Shyam Rai and former partner Sanjeev Khanna with murder, abduction and destruction of evidence among other offences. Peter Mukerjea was believed to be out of the country on the day of the murder but the CBI alleges he was actively involved in the conspiracy.

"Even when he was abroad he was in constant touch with Indrani," the unnamed official said. India's newspapers and TV news channels have been abuzz with details of the scandal since it first broke, with many carrying complex family trees illustrating who's who in the case. Mumbai police initially registered the case before the CBI, India's leading investigating agency, took it over in September. —AFP

Sisi also stressed that Kuwait and Egypt have very strong relations and that Egypt would never hesitate to defend its sisterly GCC states in the event of direct threats. He also stressed that history will always say that Egypt moved swiftly whenever sisterly countries were under direct threat. "The Egyptian army belongs to all Arabs," he stressed, noting that his statement of 'as long as it takes to cover the distance' really reflects this concept.

Sisi also stressed that Egypt does not interfere in other Arab countries' affairs and that it respects peoples' wills, and is capable of stopping any attacks and respond to any direct assault or threat to it or against any brotherly state, and gave an example of Egypt's attitude towards the incidents in Libya where Egypt abstained from interfering in domestic Libyan affairs or taking advantage of the critical situation there to jeopardize Libyan people's interests.

"The only time Egypt launched a military attack was when terrorist organizations slaughtered 21 Egyptians on Libyan soil," he underlined, pointing out that Egypt takes all needed measures to ensure its capability to cope with regional changes and challenges despite its critical economic circumstances. He also referred to the efforts exerted by the Egyptian armed forces to update and develop its weaponry and equipment.

Sisi spoke about developments in the Arab world and pointed out that the invasion of Kuwait in 1990 was the first blow to Arab unity as well as the first breach of Arab national security. He said today we were paying the price of the Arab world's divisions. He also stressed the importance of supporting Arab states to regain security and stability as well as maintain their national bodies and institutions in order to revive their roles as effective Arab League member states.

The president also pointed out that the Arab nation's strength lies in its unity and solidarity and urged Arab countries to stop offending each other the way Egypt was offended and defamed by some Arab and regional countries and their media after the June 30 revolution. He stressed that Egypt acted responsibly then and avoided similar responses in order to avoid exchanging accusations over the media that would have only led to more divisions. "Islam, Arabism and love bonds amongst Arab states should be expressed by deeds and not only words," he underlined.

Some excerpts from the interview:

Q: Are you satisfied with GCC aid and investments in Egypt after the June 30 revolution, and in view of favors Egypt has been doing to the Arab world, is there any sort of negligence?

A: The Egyptian people's needs are rapidly increasing now that the population has exceeded 90 million including 65 million below 40 years of age and 30 million below 18. There is no such thing as 'favors' amongst brothers. There is only love, reverence and appreciation. If Egypt had enough resources, it would have never hesitated to support all Arab brothers. But over the past years, Egypt has been through a difficult experience that resulted in several problems. However, after the June 30 revolution, Egyptians realized the importance of reasonable thinking and not to get carried away with people after making limited political and personal gains. The Egyptian people will manage to save Egypt from attempts of a certain bloc to kidnap it and change its national identity.

Q: Over 50,000 Kuwaiti students are currently studying in Egypt. What can the Egyptian government do to solve the problems they might face?

A: Egypt welcomes all Arab and foreign students and will never tolerate any systematic offences or abuse against them. As honorable guests, they receive utmost love and welcome from the Egyptian people and government. Some individual incidents may occur, though they are very decisively dealt with and fought. Egypt also hosts a large number of Arabs who live side by side with Egyptians and enjoy the same services.

Q: Egyptian economic indicators have been improving. Yet, GCC and foreign investments have not increased and this reflects a need to review monetary policies and adopt new ideas. What do you recommend?

A: Egypt has suffered from the consequences of two consecutive revolutions over the past few years, which led to sluggish performance in various institutions and deterioration in basic facilities such as electricity and natural gas. In addition, terrorism has been attacking various public facilities. However, efforts exerted over the past period contributed to overcoming power outages and providing enough natural gas supplies for factories to resume normal rates of productivity. The government also takes all needed legislative and procedural measures to improve services and public facilities in addition to providing suitable circumstances to attract Arab investments and encourage them to make use of the promising opportunities and projects Egypt offers them.

Q: Are we about to witness a regional war?

A: I hope not. Arab countries have to assess various situations and possible options. They have to unite and reinforce joint Arab Action.

Q: What about the Syrian crisis?

A: The Egyptian attitude towards the Syrian crisis has been always clear and steady. It is mainly built on not interfering in Syrian domestic affairs, respecting the Syrian people's will, fighting terrorists and insurgents and working out a political solution that would maintain Syria's safety and solidarity as well as pave the way for reconstruction efforts. This attitude reflects the steady Egyptian foreign policy that is keen on not interfering in other countries' domestic affairs except in case of direct threats to one of its brotherly countries.

The best proof that countries must only provide military assistance in cases of direct threats can be that of the participation of Kuwaiti troops in the 1973 war on both the Egyptian and Syrian fronts as well as Egyptian troops' participation in the second Gulf war. Egypt will never hesitate to send its troops to the Gulf, including dear Kuwait, once more to defend them from direct threats. I will immediately send Egyptian troops to help Kuwaiti brothers defend themselves and their country in case of any direct threat. The same applies to other GCC states. Protecting citizens" safety and security is not only a matter of nationalism. It is also a religious, patriotic and ethical duty because our religion rejects terrorizing people.

Q: Can Egyptians in Kuwait anticipate some good news...

A: Well, I can assure them that their country will remain safe and tell them that we are doing the best we can to develop it. Egypt looks forward to the contributions of Egyptians abroad to support this process of development and construction.

Q: The speech you made in the parliament seemed like a roadmap towards achieving economic development. Is there a roadmap to revive tourism, especially as we visited Sharm el-Sheikh and explored the huge touristic potentials Egypt has? Why does not Egypt focus on attracting Arab tourists?

A: We welcome all Arab tourists, especially since compared to other international touristic destinations, Egypt has the advantage of sharing the culture with other Arab countries, which is more relaxing for Arab tourists and makes them feel at home. The significance of the touristic sector to the Egyptian economy is obvious, as five million Egyptians work in this sector that used to make an annual income of \$14 billion before 2011. The government is already working on activating tourism, be it local, Arab or foreign. Egypt is keen on providing all possible means to make the best use of its outstanding location and endless monuments in addition to its moderate climate. Accordingly, all Arab tourists are welcome to spend their vacations in their second home country - Egypt. Egypt has also launched several campaigns to encourage Arab tourists to visit it.

Q: What about Egypt's relations with Russia?

A: Egypt has deep-rooted historic relations with Russia that have been outstanding in many fields including military cooperation. Generally speaking, Egypt follows a balanced foreign policy that is open to all countries worldwide and is based on mutual respect and achieving joint interests. Egypt has stable strategic relations with the US as well as European and Asian countries including China and Japan. — KUNA

MPS SLAM REDUCTIONS IN OVERSEAS TREATMENT

ABDALY CELL MEMBERS DENY CHARGES

KUWAIT: Lawmakers yesterday intensified their opposition to government measures to reduce financial allocations for sending Kuwaiti patients abroad for medical treatment with some of them threatening to grill the health minister.

MP Awdah Al-Awdah said he waited to get an explanation from the government but that never came and it appears that the government no longer wants to cooperate with the assembly or wants confrontation with it. Awdah said that if there needs to be any cuts in spending, it should start with lawmakers and ministers and spare citizens, especially patients.

The Cabinet on Monday decided to cut financial allocations for Kuwaiti patients who are sent abroad for treatment. It said patients will be paid KD 50 per day in the United States and Europe and KD 30 to other countries. Those accompanying them will be paid nothing. The government will bear the expenses of the treatment

MP Faisal Al-Kandari said he and a group of MPs will submit a motion to debate the government's decision to cut overseas treatment allocations during the next Assembly session on March 1. He said the debate is needed to stand against the government's unilateral decision to cut medical treatment abroad.

The lawmaker said it is unacceptable for the government to reduce the expenses to such lows and the new amounts are not sufficient to cover expenses in those countries in light of the high cost of living. He said the motion has been coordinated with a large number of

MPs who are opposed to the government's decision, adding that the austerity that the government wants will not be allowed to come at the expense of citizens.

MP Mohammad Al-Jabri said it is shameful that economic reforms should come at the expense of citizens' health and medical care, adding it is strange to cut allocations for medical treatment abroad when "we don't have the required medical care in the country". He urged the government to seek other solutions for reforms away from people's health.

Meanwhile, 23 Kuwaitis accused of joining Lebanese militia Hezbollah and spying for Iran yesterday denied the charges at the appeals court which began their trial. Three of the 26-member "Abdaly cell" are at large and were sentenced by the criminal court in absentia. They include the only Iranian national who was sentenced to death for allegedly recruiting the members for Hezbollah and arranging military training.

Of the 23 who attended the first appeals court hearing, one was sentenced to death, another to a life term while 17 were handed jail terms between two and 15 years. Four were acquitted. The case of the three at large will not be handled by the appeals court.

The defendants categorically denied that they joined Hezbollah or were part of a plot to launch attacks against Kuwait. They claimed they were tortured to extract false confessions. The leading figure who received death sentence said he collected the arms seized from him during the 1990-91 Iraqi invasion. The judge refused demands by defense lawyers to free the defendants on bail and order a medical examination. The next hearing was set for March 15.

Ankara blast kills 28

ANKARA: Twenty-eight people were killed and dozens wounded in Turkey's capital Ankara yesterday when a car laden with explosives detonated next to military buses near the armed forces' headquarters, parliament and other government buildings. The Turkish military condemned what it described as a terrorist attack on the buses as they waited at traffic lights in the administrative heart of the city.

A government spokesman said 28 people had been killed and 61 wounded in the blast, which took place near a busy intersection less than 500 m from parliament during the evening rush hour. Justice Minister Bekir Bozdag described the attack as an act of terrorism and told parliament, which was in session when the blast occurred, that the car had exploded on a part of the street lined on both sides by military vehicles.

Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu, who had been due to leave for meetings in Brussels later yesterday, cancelled the trip, an official in his office said. President Tayyip Erdogan postponed a planned visit to Azerbaijan. A senior Turkish security source said initial signs indicated that Kurdish militants from the outlawed Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) were responsible. Separate security sources in the mainly Kurdish southeast, however, said they believed Islamic State militants may have been behind the bombing. There was no immediate claim of responsibility.

"I heard a huge explosion. There was smoke and a

really strong smell even though we were blocks away," a Reuters witness said. "We could immediately hear ambulance and police car sirens rushing to the scene." A health ministry official said the authorities were still trying to determine the number of dead and wounded, who had been taken to several hospitals in the area. Images on social media showed the charred wreckage of at least two buses and a car. The explosion, which came shortly after 6:30 pm (1630 GMT), sent a large plume of smoke above central Ankara.

Turkey, a NATO member, faces multiple security threats. It is part of a U.S.-led coalition fighting Islamic State in neighboring Syria and Iraq, and has been shelling Kurdish militia fighters in northern Syria in recent days. It has also been battling PKK militants in its own southeast where a 2-1/2 year ceasefire collapsed last July, plunging the region into its worst violence since the 1990s. The PKK, which has fought a three-decade insurgency for Kurdish autonomy, has frequently attacked military targets in the past, although it has largely focused its campaign on the mainly Kurdish southeast.

Yesterday's bombing comes after an attack in Ankara in October blamed on Islamic State, when two suicide bombers struck a rally of pro-Kurdish and labor activists outside the capital's main train station, killing more than 100 people. A suicide bombing in the historic heart of Istanbul in January, also blamed on Islamic State, killed 10 German tourists. — Reuters

Azmi earlier said that thick gas seen being emitted at the site was "caused by putting out the blaze". He said "no reading of any H2S (hydrogen sulfide) gas leak from the incident" had been recorded at the oilfield. KUNA said that the Environmental Public Authority confirmed that the gas contained no hazardous elements. In a later statement, Azmi said the spill had not affected KOC's operations and production processes in Kuwait, a major oil producer and OPEC member. Kuwaiti media published photos of a fire it said was burning at the scene. The Al-Rai news service said pho-

tos of a large fire were circulating on social media.

Separately, Kuwait signed a deal to export 100,000 barrels of oil per day (bpd) with a major refiner, with a potential annual return of \$2 billion, KUNA reported yesterday. "The contract is one of the important strategic agreements that reinforces Kuwait's position as a main oil supplier in the Asian markets," Nabil Bouresli, managing director of international marketing at Kuwait Petroleum Corp (KPC) was quoted by KUNA as saying. Kuwait plans to raise its crude oil production by 150,000 bpd in the third quarter and aims to sign new export deals with European customers soon, Bouresli has said earlier this month. — Agencies

RUSSIA, TURKEY RUN RISK OF ESCALATION

urkey and Russia are already waging a proxy war in Syria as Istanbul backs rebels against Syrian government troops supported by Moscow. But the recent escalation in rhetoric has sharpened fears of a direct confrontation, analysts warn. The two major players in the Syrian conflict have historic enmities dating back to the 16th century with the first Russo-Turkish wars, and more recently the Crimean War between Russia and the Ottoman Empire backed by Britain and France, in the mid-19th century.

Russia's bombing campaign in Syria that began in September and the Turkish shelling of Kurdish positions in Syria have effectively created a separate subcrisis within the geopolitical cluster bomb of the fiveyear-long war. This conflict is also being played out on the ground as rebel groups backed in particular by Turkey are attempting to contain the advance of Syrian troops supported by Moscow, which is also backing Turkey's sworn enemies the Syrian Kurds.

'Eve of Confrontation'

Currently the conflict between Moscow and Ankara is primarily a war of words. But analysts warn it could spiral into a real clash. "We are on the eve of such a confrontation. Not because anyone plans to attack anyone else. But when there are so many weapons and armies and intersecting interests, chance can play a major role," said Alexander Konovalov of the Strategic Analysis Institute in Moscow. Ankara this week railed against Russia's bombing, threatening an "extremely decisive response" and calling strikes "vile, cruel and barbaric".

Moscow for its part has condemned Ankara's "provocative" shelling of Kurdish positions in the strategic northern Aleppo province, and on Tuesday said that Turkish security services are training militants from ex-Soviet countries that are then dispatched to Syria. Turkey has openly suggested it could launch a ground operation against the Islamic State group alongside its allies, particularly Saudi Arabia, which could lead to a direct confrontation with Russian forces.

Kurdish Zone in Syria

Along with the fate of Assad, the question of the Kurds is one of the main obstacles to agreement between Turkey and Russia. Turkey wants to prevent the Kurds, who already control a large part of northern Syria, from establishing a permanent presence west of the Euphrates river and creating an autonomous zone on the Turkish border. The Syrian Kurds have benefited from the alliance with Russia and this month opened a representative office in Moscow. Asked about the risk of an escalation with Turkey Tuesday, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said "he would rather not answer," adding that "our relations are in a deep crisis."


Turkish 'Stab in Back'

The climate of confrontation has intensified since late November when Turkish F-16 fighters downed a Russian bomber plane which Ankara said strayed into its air space. Russia was swift to react to this "stab in the back" with economic sanctions followed by a beefingup of its firepower in Syria, notably deploying its latest S-400 air defence systems. Meanwhile Putin accused his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayvip Erdogan of involvement in illegal oil trading with Islamic State jihadists in Syria.

Before the conflict, Erdogan was often likened to Putin with both keeping a grip on power and using glories of past empires to boost patriotism while cracking down on rights. An escalation is possible if Turkey launches the ground operation, said independent military analyst Alexander Golts: "Russia will face the alternative to evacuate immediately and lose face or launch a ground operation."

This showdown has sparked concern in Washington and Brussels as Turkey is a NATO member and can rely on support of other members if there is an attack on its soil, making the current situation potentially explosive. "Even while expressing official support for Turkey, NATO will do all it can to restrain the Turks from any abrupt moves in Syria," Golts said. There is "a risk of the Syrian crisis transforming into a whole new one, a very dangerous level: direct military confrontation between the region's states," Nikolai Bordyuzha, the head of the Collective Security Treaty Organisation made up of Russia and former Soviet states told the Interfax news agency. "The consequences of such a turn of events are hard to predict." —AFP

ENCRYPTION DEBATE FORCED INTO COURTS

pple's challenge of a court order to unlock an iPhone used by one of the San Bernardino killers opens up a new front in the long-running battle between technology companies and the government over encryption. The standoff brings the sensitive issue, which has been at a stalemate in Congress, into the courts, which could ultimately impose a decision with wide-ranging consequences. A California magistrate on Tuesday ordered Apple to provide "reasonable technical assistance" to the US Federal Bureau of Investigation to break into an iPhone used by one of the shooters in the deadly December rampage.

Apple quickly said it would fight the judge's order. Chief executive Tim Cook called it "an unprecedented step which threatens the security of our customers," and said the order "has implications far beyond the legal case at hand". Apple, Google and other technology firms in recent years have stepped up encryption - allowing only claiming improved security and privacy is needed to maintain confidence in the digital world.

That drive for privacy has prompted sharp objections from law enforcement and intelligence officials, who claim that criminals and extremists are able to hide their illicit activities thanks to device encryption. "This is a clever move by the FBI to move from the legislative arena, where they were not winning, to the courts," said Joseph Hall, chief technologist at the Center for Democracy & Technology, a digital rights group. "They appear to be asking for Apple to produce a version of iOS that removes the glue to keep security working."

The order raised hackles among privacy advocates, which see the potential to unleash unbridled surveillance in the United States and elsewhere. "If the FBI can force Apple to hack into its customers' devices, then so too can every repressive regime in the rest of the world," said Alex Abdo of the American Civil Liberties Union.

"Apple deserves praise for standing up for its right to offer secure devices to all of its customers."

Debate on 1789 Law

The case is likely to work its way through the courts, which will need to consider a number of both technical and legal questions. Interestingly, Magistrate Judge Sheri Pym's order is based on the 1789 All Writs Act, which lays out broad authority for the courts to help enforcement of the law. Legal scholar Jonathan Turley of the George Washington University said Pym "has gone far beyond what I consider the scope of her authority" and that her actions "appear almost legislative

in nature". "Congress has not ordered such back door access to be supplied by companies and such a move would raise difficult privacy questions," Turley said in a blog post. The order also "raises chilling constitutional questions that should be fully reviewed by a federal district court judge and an appellate court," Turley said. Berin Szoka, president of the libertarian think tank TechFreedom, said the order goes against "bedrock principles of law and privacy".

"If forcing Apple to hack its own devices qualifies as 'reasonable technical assistance,' there is no practical limit to what law enforcement could force private companies to do to compromise the security of their systems," Szoka said in a

> Darren Hayes, a Pace University professor of computer forensics, argued that Apple and other tech companies may have gone too far by using encryption that, in theory, makes it impossible for the firms to hand over evidence even if served with a legal warrant. "I think that the public, once they become more educated about what is happening, might change their stance about Apple," said Hayes, who has worked as a consultant to law enforcement. "This case is sensitive for the US public and I don't think it's particularly good public relations for Appl refuse to help the investigation, Hayes added.

A key question is whether Apple has the ability to provide the assistance sought by the FBI. CDT's Hall said that Apple "has never been forthcoming about the deep details of its system" but noted there is "a lot of well-informed speculation" about its encryption. "Apple does not have the keys to your device - they are burned onto your chip," Hall said. But he said it may be possible to get around that encryption. "They have software that could essentially do things that the keys can do," he said, but noted that it would probably require a weakening of the overall operating system's security. Haves said that no one knows for sure if Apple can circumvent the encryption, but noted "the fact that

Instant gratification: Fast fashion revolution

ew York Fashion Week this season has put "click and buy" on the map, revolutionizing the antiquated global fashion calendar with clothes that now can be ordered straight from the catwalk. For more than 100 years, the world of high fashion has been divided up into four seasons - spring/summer, autumn/winter. Designers debut their collections at fashion week, fashion magazines write them up and go to print a few months before the clothes are available to buy in boutiques-six months after they first grace the

But gone are the days when only magazine editors, socialites and the in-crowd grace a fashion show. The rise of Instagram, Snapchat, live feeds and bloggers now zaps images from the catwalk across the Internet in real time. That means that high-end clients no longer want to burn thousands of dollars on an outfit that has been plastered all over the Internet for six months. She's bored, she wants

"The younger customer does not want to wait any longer, they want to see it and wear it that day or the next day. So we're going to change the rules," American designer Tommy Hilfiger told AFP at his Chelsea studios. In September, Hilfiger customers will be able to buy his collection straight from the catwalk in what he calls "click and buy." This season New York designer Rebecca Minkoff led the way, launching #SEEBUY-WEAR that offered 70 percent of the items featured in her runway show for immediate purchase.

While the vast majority of New York runway shows have focused on fall/winter 2016, Minkoff's collection was immediate spring/summer 2016 - which provided the snow stops falling id just weeks around the corner. Others sticking a toe in the water are Tory Burch, Diane von Furstenberg and LaQuan Smith, who offered items from their collections for immediate sale. As with Hilfiger, British luxury label Burberry and Tom Ford are scheduled to follow suit in September.

Difficult Challenge

The Council of Fashion Designers of America has hired consultants to suggest changes and is to release its findings in March, but already considers the current

model redundant and confusing. "We're entering a society where people to be able to click on what they see and buy it," said Marshal Cohen, a retail industry analyst at The NPD Group. "It is all about fast fashion, speed to market, convenience to the consumer."

But Cohen said it would be tough to enact change. "It's going to be a difficult challenge... because some of these people design these things a year and half, two years in advance. It takes eight months to make a pattern. They're going to have to learn how to speed it up." So great is the lag that high street giants can beat high-end designers to it. For example, Swedish fast fashion giants H&M can spot something on the runway, make a copy and have it in stores in two months, Cohen said.

"We think it will only accelerate over time," Minkoff told AFP. Until now the timetable has been "easy and safe and comfortable," she said. "We like to take risks and we're not afraid of taking risks." The effect on sales remains to be seen but Uri Minkoff, CEO of his sister's label, said sales were up 10 percent from wholesale partners in the last month. 'They're so excited. Right now, the stores can act on all this big press and excitement," he said.

But American designer Zac Posen expressed reservations about sustainability. "Fast fashion is gonna destroy the world, it's going to pollute the oceans," he told AFP backstage at his fashion show. In last few years, the amount of clothing being thrown out had tripled and quadrupled, he said. "It's great that there's accessible style items, but just like you saw... in the food industry, where we went into people understanding sustainability and sourcing of where things come, the same will happen in fashion," he said. —AFP

UNRANKED THAI PLAYER GETS 18-MONTH BAN

LONDON: Unranked Thai player Jatuporn Nalamphun has been suspended for 18 months and fined \$5,000 after being found guilty of betting on tennis matches and not cooperating with the investigation, the Tennis Integrity Unit (TIU) said. "The 22-year-old admitted to three breaches of... the (anti corruption) program, which prohibits betting on tennis matches, between July and November 2014," the TIU said in a statement yesterday. Jatuporn was suspended for six months and a fined \$5,000 for the betting offences but was then handed a concurrent 18-month ban after being "found guilty of a further charge of failing to cooperate with a TIU Investigation". "The full and timely cooperation by participants in TIU investigations is of paramount importance in the efforts being made by the TIU to eliminate corruption in professional tennis," anti-corruption hearing officer Ian Mill said. Tennis is still reeling from widespread allegations of corruption in the sport and the independent review panel (IRP), which was launched last month, will take at least a year to complete its investigations. RETIRING PACQUIAO **OPENS DOOR TO** MAYWEATHER REMATCH

GENERAL SANTOS: Philippine boxing great Manny Pacquiao has opened the door to a lucrative rematch with Floyd Mayweather, telling AFP he still intends to retire after his next fight but that a comeback is possible. The 37-yearold announced in January that his upcoming bout against American Timothy Bradley would be his last so he could concentrate on Filipino politics. However, following a highenergy training session in his hometown of General Santos, Pacquiao said he was loving the sport as much as ever and he could not rule out fighting again.

"It's hard to say right now," Pacquiao, who has won world titles in an unprecedented eight weight divisions, told AFP in an interview when asked about retirement.

"I made my decision already that after this fight I (will) retire. But I am not saying that, you know, boxing is closed to me. You never know." Pacquiao made the comments when asked if a chance to avenge his crushing loss to American nemesis Mayweather last year would lure him out of retirement. That fight shattered boxing revenue records, generating 4.5 million pay-per-view purchases and \$600 million in gross revenue. It capped a phenomenal rise for Pacquiao, whose journey from street kid to mega-rich athlete is a source of hope and inspiration for tens of millions of poor Filipinos.

Until this week, Pacquiao had insisted repeatedly that he was very happy to be giving up the sport to pursue politics and his goal of fighting poverty in the Philippines.

Pacquiao, a two-term congressman, is looking to win a Senate seat in May elections, and the official campaign is already underway. Pacquiao spoke at length on Tuesday about his political aspirations-including the prospect of

And he repeated that, at this point, his intention was to retire from boxing after fighting Bradley for the third time in Las Vegas on April 9. But Pacquiao also indicated he wasn't sure his retirement would be permanent, twice using the term: "You never know".

'PLEASE FORGIVE ME'

He also insisted he remained as physically capable in the ring as a decade ago. "I don't feel different compared (with) when I was 27, 25," Pacquiao said. "I am still the same because I discipline myself. Even if I don't have a fight and I am not in training, I always exercise every day." Pacquiao aggravated a shoulder injury in the Mayweather bout and underwent surgery five days later. He said Tuesday his shoulder had recovered and he was in "100 percent" condition to take on Bradley.

After overseeing training on Monday, long-time American mentor Freddie Roach also said he suspected Pacquiao would be tempted back into the ring if he beats Bradley. "I'll go along with him right now because he is running for senator," Roach told AFP, when asked if he believed Pacquiao genuinely intended to retire. "But there's always that side of me that sees Senator Pacquiao (fight again). Because he likes that, he loves stuff like that," Roach said. Pacquiao is on track to win one of 12 Senate seats in the elections, according to recent surveys, with his sporting heroics largely responsible for his political popularity. However, success is not guaranteed.

Pacquiao has been heavily criticised by some in the Philippines for a dismal attendance record as a congressman that they argue highlights a lack of political conviction. Pacquiao, an evangelical Protestant, also apologised via social media on Tuesday after saying on the campaign trail that homosexuals were "worse than animals". "It's common sense. Do you see animals mating with the same sex? Animals are better because they can distinguish male from female," Pacquiao told television station TV5.

After a barrage of criticism, Pacquiao asked for forgiveness. "I'm sorry for comparing homosexuals to animals. Please forgive me for those I've hurt," Pacquiao said in a video post on Instagram. — AFP















SAHARA'S FORCE INDIA STAKE LOOKS A HARD SELL

LONDON/MUMBAI: India's embattled Sahara conglomerate said it wants to sell its 42.5 percent stake in the Force India Formula One team to help release founder Subrata Roy from jail, but some motor racing insiders are sceptical about how easy it will be to find a buyer.

Sahara, which paid \$100 million for the shareholding in 2011, sought the Indian Supreme Court's permission this month to dispose of Force India and other assets to raise a combined 53 billion Indian rupees (\$778.38 million)

However, former Jordan, Jaguar and Red Bull marketing executive Mark Gallagher said such a sale would not be

"I don't think anybody will pay 100 million pounds, euros or dollars for 42.5 percent of a mid-level F1 franchise," Gallagher told Reuters.

Others said it would be easier to dispose of the stake if the whole team - run by beer baron Vijay Mallya who also owns 42.5 percent - were up for sale because a buyer would want outright

control. With Formula One far less popular than cricket in India, and Mallya under pressure from lenders to meet loan repayment obligations linked to his grounded Kingfisher Airlines, the stake on its own could be a hard sell.

Lenders who are owed more than \$1 billion by Kingfisher have started putting up for sale some of the carrier's assets. Kingfisher has not flown since 2012 due to a lack of cash. "Unless you are just doing it for sponsorship, I imagine you would want control. And generally sponsors don't want to be shareholders," Finbarr O'Connell, administrator for the failed Caterham team, told Reuters.

A Sahara spokesman said in an emailed statement that there were "no talks with anybody at the moment" about selling the Formula One team stake.

Force India's Chief Operating Officer Otmar Szafnauer, asked whether Mallya's permission was needed for any potential sale by his co-owners, told Reuters he did not know the details of Sahara's shareholder agreements.

OWNERSHIP CHANGE

Formula One has only 11 teams and any change of ownership, particularly if it might bring more funding, is of major interest to fans.

Force India, the first and only Indianregistered team, have a loyal following particularly in Mexico thanks to Mexican driver Sergio Perez.

Mallya, who brought Sahara into the British-based team after buying it in 2007, turned 60 in December and recently told India's Economic Times it was "time to slow down, semi-retire and enjoy life". He was not immediately available for comment on Sahara's request and his own F1 intentions. Bernie Ecclestone, the 85-year-old Formula One supremo who has known Mallya for decades, told Reuters he was "quite sure the last thing Vijay wants to do is to quit". That said, he added, every team has its price. "There's a lot of teams that if

somebody comes along with the right cheque, they would sell," said Ecclestone. "Not because they want to, but because commercially they probably think it would be the right thing to do."

COLLATERAL PACKAGE

Mallya's Force India holding forms part of a package held as collateral by British-based drinks giant Diageo to underpin a \$135 million loan to Watson Ltd, one of his affiliated companies, Diageo said in an earnings press release last month.

The package also includes shares in United Breweries Ltd , a unit of Mallya's UB Group and India's largest brewer. Diageo acquired a stake in Mallya's United Spirits company in 2012 and later gained management control.

Dutch entrepreneur Michiel Mol owns the remaining 15 percent of the Force India team, which finished a bestever fifth last year. The team can expect about \$75 million in annual prize money and revenue payments for the next three years, according to informed sources.

Sahara needs to pay back 360 billion rupees (\$5.3 billion), raised from millions of small investors through the sale of bonds ruled by the Supreme Court to be illegal, before Roy can be released.

It also needs to show it has a plan to raise the money, giving the group time to seal deals and avert any courtimposed seizure and auctions.

The Indian Supreme Court on Feb. 2 asked markets regulator SEBI to state within two weeks whether it has any opposition to Sahara's proposal, according to court documents seen by Reuters. The case will next be heard in New Delhi on March 29.

Force India's 2015 budget, according to figures published by Britain's Autosport magazine, was about 110 million pounds (\$159.59 million).

Cash flow has been a problem in the past and the team were granted an advance on this season's championship money.—Reuters

FOUR CITIES OPEN CAMPAIGN TO HOST 2024 OLYMPICS

LAUSANNE: Candidature files from Paris, Rome, Los Angeles and Budapest to host the 2024 Olympic Games, sport's most glittering event, were all delivered on schedule, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) confirmed yesterday.

The new Candidature Process encourages the cities to present projects which match their sports, economic, social and environmental long-term regional planning needs.

This is part of the 'Olympic 2020 agenda' which also insists on the use of existing facilities and provides flexibility for the venues to meet local sustainability and legacy needs.

A delighted IOC President Thomas Bach, confirming the four top drawer candidates, was clearly impressed with a first look at the bids on Wednesday and said he was looking forward to a fascinating competition. "Los Angeles, Rome, Budapest and Paris are all submitting projects fully in line with Olympic Agenda 2020," he said. "It is impressive to see how they have incorporated the Olympic project into the longterm development plans of their city, region and country. Coming from different starting points, for all four there is a clear focus on sustainable development, legacy and in particular how the facilities are going to be used after the Olympic Games.

The candidate files under the new procedure are delivered in three phases and the IOC will confirm (or not) the cities passing their criteria at that stage.

Wednesday's first instalment deals with global vision, Games concept and strategy. These will now be studied by IOC working groups who will deliver reports by June

Phase two propositions dealing with governance, legal matters and venue fund-

ing are due by 7 October 2016. And the final dossier on Games delivery, experience and venue legacy are not due until 3 February 2017.

FOLLOW THE SUN

Los Angeles 2024 Olympic bid chiefs decided not to hold a launch ceremony instead kicking off their campaign by unveiling an official logo of an angel basking in rays of Californian sunshine on Tuesday as the city bids to stage the games for a third time after 1932 and 1984.

The logo is accompanied by an official slogan, urging people to "Follow the Sun" by supporting the Los Angeles bid.

Existing installations such as the Staples Center, the LA Coliseum, the Rose Bowl, and university stadiums will be used with athletes to be housed on the UCLA campus. The Hungarian capital Budapest has announced a modest budget of 2.4 billion euros (\$2.7 billion) to build thier entire infrastructure.

No launch ceremony will take place in there after opponents, fearing spiralling costs and risks of corruption, tried to force a citizens referendum to block the bid, as was the case with Hamburg. Rome bid president Luca Di Montezemolo presided over a ceremony which was broadcast on state-owned television RAI.

With the Colosseum as their emblem and the city's major tourist attractions as venues, the Italian capital will build on its strengths and existing infrastructure.

Paris bid committee president Bernard Lapasset will confirm a budget of 3.2 billion euros for infrastructure, with existing stadiums, arenas and world recognized landmarks all on the bill.

The vote for the host city will take place on September 13, 2017 in Lima. —AFP

AMERICAN CYCLIST CORYN RIVERA RIDING FAST TO RIO

KANSAS CITY: The sprightly girl aboard the hand-me-down bike had started to cry, tears trickling down her cheeks 50 miles into the longest ride of her life.

Coryn Rivera's father had ridden off ahead of her. She wasn't happy about getting left behind. "I still remember that," Wally Rivera said with a laugh, recalling the scene nearly 15 years later. "She was crying and crying because I didn't wait for her." These days, Coryn is the one everyone is trying to catch.

The dynamic sprinter has become arguably the most decorated cyclist in American history, the winner of an astounding 71 national championships. Her closets back home in Tustin, California, overflow with medals, trophies and other plaudits from triumphs stretching back more than a decade. She's also only 22 years old. And just getting started.

Rivera's big goal this year is qualifying for the Rio Olympics, then adding to her extraordinary collection of hardware on the rolling hills of coastal Brazil come August. "The Olympics is really an aura," she told The Associated Press. "To even attend the Olympics is one thing. To be an Olympic champion is one of the pinnacles of women's cycling."

The Olympics have always been an odd-ball event in cycling. Courses tend to favor sprinters or climbers, rarely giving everyone an equal shot, and the one-day nature of the road race means a rider having a particularly good day - or exceptionally bad day - can shake up the podium. As a result, the Grand Tours - the Giro d'Italia, Tour de France and Vuelta a Espana - along with certain classics and the world championships tend to be more revered among the world's best cyclists.

CROWN JEWEL

But there is no Tour de France in women's cycling. Nor are there other major stage races so steeped in tradition. So the Olympics have become the sport's crown jewel.

it's something I tuned into," Rivera said. "I can feel the passion and pride that people put into their work, and how they represent their country, and it's a feeling I would love to experience. It's historic. It's legendary." It's something even she

"As a kid, every Summer and Winter Olympics,

thought was a long shot four years ago.

Rivera began riding when her father, a motocross racer-turned-laboratory scientist, put her on a tandem bike when she was 8 or 9. She quickly graduated to her own bike and began tagging along when Wally and his buddies hit the road. But it turned out she had a fierce competitive streak, and soon Rivera was blitzing her father and everyone else on those informal group rides. Eventually, Wally took her to the Redlands Bicycle Classic, the longest-running stage race in America. There was a public race and "she just crushed everybody," he recalled.

"Starting off, she had to race with older kids -16-year-olds sometimes - and she was still just 9 or 10, and she kept winning races," Wally Rivera said. Her ascent was about as rapid as her finishing sprint. Rivera quickly won national titles in her age group, then branched out into other disciplines and swept those. There were years she won nationals on the road, in the time trial and on the track, as well as titles in criteriums, mountain biking and cyclocross - a hybrid of off-road and road cycling.

Rivera captured the attention of USA Cycling, earned invitations to prestigious camps and landed a professional contract with her current team, UnitedHealthcare Pro Cycling.

"Right away, she was being successful. She's just one of the talented few," said Mike Tamayo, the US-based team's general manager and sporting director.

REFOCUS

"The trick with a rider like Coryn is to make sure you're always feeding the beast," Tamayo said. "She needs success. Success breeds success. She keeps hitting those goals, it only makes her want more." Missing those goals drives her just as much, though.

At the world championships last fall in Richmond, Virginia, she found herself leading the breakaway with about a mile left, only to get swept up by the rest of the field before the finish. It was an impressive showing but a disap-

pointing result, and it stuck with Rivera when she took time off over the winter. She finished up her degree at Marian University in Indianapolis, recharged her batteries and began to refocus for her ride to Rio.

It started with a second-place finish in the San Luis Grand Prix in Argentina, then a victory in the opening stage of the Tour Femenino de San Luis. After training camp in Florida, she raced in the Tour of Qatar and is now off to Europe for a campaign that Rivera hopes earns that Olympic bid.

There are four spots on the US team, and Megan Guarnier has already locked up one with her bronze medal at worlds. Two spots will go to time trial specialists, which leaves Rivera only one opportunity.

Winning one of the WorldTour events would virtually assure her of it. "We built a European campaign with the focus on giving her a chance to win the WorldTour races she can win," Tamayo said. "We built a team around her. We have the variables we controlled the best we can."

But cycling is an unpredictable sport, one slip-up leading to disaster. So while Rivera is focused on qualifying for Rio, she knows there will be plenty of chances to shine on the world stage. After all, she's 22 years old. And just getting started. — AP

BOASSON HAGEN TAKES LEAD IN TOUR OF OMAN

Today's third stage covers 176.5km from Al Sawadi Beach to Nasseem Park and looks set to end in a bunch sprint. Friday's stage however looks cut out for the pure climbers such as Nibali or Frenchman Romain Bardet. —AFP

"The building blocks of our project are total transparency, a 'low-cost' approach and bringing general improvement to the city," said Di Montezemolo. With the Colosseum as their emblem and the city's major tourist attractions as venues. Rome intends to build on its strengths and existing infrastructure to avoid, like its rivals, unnecessary and unpopular costs. Montezemolo, the former Ferrari chief, claims 70 % of the facilities required to host events around Rome, which hosted the

1960 Games, are already in place.
In a bid to avoid constructing "white elephant" stadiums or venues, the construction of temporary venues is in the pipeline. "More than 70 % of the sites are already available. If we had to organise the opening ceremony tomorrow, as well as the athletics and swimming events, we could," said Di Montezemolo.

The race to host the 2024 Olympics began in earnest Wednesday with the four bid cities-Budapest, Los Angeles, Paris and Rome-all presenting their initial candidature files to the International Olympic Committee (IOC). Rome believes the stunning backdrop of some of its famous historical sites offers competitors, spectators and millions of viewers around the the chance to take a unique trip back in time.

Athletes would step up to receive their medals in front of the Colosseum, the cycling road races would be held around the ancient sites of the Fori Imperiali and archery events would be held at the Baths of Caracalla. The marathon races would pass by St. Peter's Basilica, a synagogue and a mosque and the Circus Maximus-in antiquity, the venue that hosted brutal chariot races. A Rome Olympics would be held around three key centres: the Foro Italico, built in the 1920s and completed, notably the Stadio Olimpico, ahead of the 1960 Games, the Fiera di Roma and Tor Vergata, which would host the Olympic Village.

Di Montezemolo said their budget for permanent venues (pricipally the Olympic Village and the press centre), would rise to 2.1 bn (billion) euros.

"It's our plan to build temporary venues. We don't want to be left with any white elephants," he said. —AFP

The predicament of being Ajinkya Rahane

NEW DELHI: With a "no-vacancy" sign plastered on India's top order and his utility in the middle questioned by his own captain, Ajinkya Rahane suddenly finds his consistency with the bat means

The 27-year-old Mumbai batsman has forced his way into the final 15 for next month's World Twenty20 on home soil but is unlikely to play a major role in the hosts' bid for a second 20-over World title under Mahendra Singh Dhoni.

The left-right combination of Shikhar Dhawan and Rohit Sharma have locked up the opening slots, followed by batting mainstay Virat Kohli and limited overs specialist Suresh Raina.

An industrious accumulator in a lineup teeming with swashbuckling powerhitters, Rahane can only hope for a middle order slot but Dhoni, forthright as ever, has virtually dismissed the possibility. Dhoni insists Rahane, as evident from his consistent performance in the Indian Premier League (IPL) Twenty20 competition, is at his best as an opener and lacks the muscle power to excel as a lowerorder slogger.

"When both the openers perform well, it makes life slightly difficult for the skipper," the India captain told reporters on Tuesday. "Rahane, at the end of the day, is a fantastic player but you also have to consider the fact that in

done really well when he is opening the batting.

"If you look at the team we have got for the Twenty20 World Cup, you find it difficult to find a place for him." An automatic selection in the test team, Rahane has a strike rate of 114 in T20 Internationals and is among the rare batsmen who can score freely and still not offend the purists with his shot-mak-

Almost an anachronism in an exuberant group that wears its heart on its sleeve, the soft-spoken Rahane notched up six half-centuries in his last 10 oneday international knocks, floating from

Twenty20, he is somebody who has one to seventh position in the batting order.

and Eric Radford of Canada are defending their title.

Among the medal contenders are World silver medallists Sui Wenjing and Han Cong of China-their compatriots Yu Xiaoyu and Jin Yang will also vie for the title, with American champions Tarah Kayne and Daniel O'Shea also hopeful.

In the ice dance event, defending champions Kaitlyn Weaver and Andrew Poje of Canada are eyeing their third title and come in confident after taking the ISU Grand Prix final earlier this season.

Other top competitors include newly crowned US champions Maia Shibutani and Alex Shibutani, and 2015 World and Four Continents silver medallists Madison Chock and Evan Bates, also from the United States.

More than 90 skaters representing 15 ISU members from around the world are competing at the event, which runs from Thursday to Sunday at Taiwan's Taipei Arena.

"We hope to promote skating in Taiwan by hosting the competition. With the world's top skaters coming (to Taiwan), local audiences can enjoy top quality performances without having to fly abroad while local skaters can have the opportunities to learn from them," said Eddy Wu, secretary-general of Chinese Taipei Skating Union. Tsao Chih-i and Amy Lin will represent Taiwan in the men's and women's events, respectively. — AFP

DEL POTRO MAKES WINNING RETURN AT DELRAY BEACH OPEN

DELRAY BEACH: Juan Martin del Potro thrust his arms into the air, blew a kiss skyward and began tossing his sweat-soaked wristbands into the crowd. This was one sweet victory for the Argentine. Del Potro beat American Denis Kudla 6-1, 6-4 in the first round of the Delray Beach Open on Tuesday in his first ATP match in 11 months following a left wrist injury.

Del Potro's win was a relief to tournament organizers after their top two seeds each had a quick exit. Kevin Anderson, the No. 1 seed and 2012 champion, was forced to retire from his match against Austin Krajicek due to a right shoulder injury. Hours later, second-seeded Bernard Tomic of Australia lost to American Rajeev Ram, 7-6 (3), 6-1.

The 27-year-old del Potro played just four matches last year and 10 in 2014. He has faced four surgeries one on his right wrist and three on his left - since defeating Roger Federer in the 2009 US Open final.


Once ranked in the top 10, del Potro is down to No. 1,041. Against Kudla, he was surprisingly consistent, losing just 10 points on his serve in the match - five of them on double faults. Rather than pound his once potent two-handed backhand, del Potro employed a new-found one-handed slice shot.

Del Potro next plays today against Australian John-Patrick Smith. When asked about his opponent, a former All-American at the University of Tennessee, del Potro shrugged his shoulders and deadpanned, "I don't know him. For two years I was at home watching 'The Simpsons."

Anderson had just dropped the first set to the 103rd-ranked American in a 7-3 tiebreaker when he sauntered to the sideline, packed his racket bag, shook his opponent's hand and walked off the court. Anderson also pulled out of the first tournament of the year in Chennai and retired from his opening match at the Australian Open last month due to a left-knee injury.

Krajicek was one of seven Americans to advance to the second round. Donald Young, a finalist last year, moved on when Mikhail Kukushkin of Kazakhstan retired with a leg injury while trailing 7-6 (3), 3-0. Sixth-seeded Steve Johnson squeaked past Australian John Millman 6-3, 5-7, 7-6 (10-8), and Sam Querrey defeated Thiemo de Bakker 4-6, 6-3, 6-4.

Taylor Fritz, who reached the final in just his third ATP World Tour level tournament in Memphis last week, was clearly fatigued in a 6-3, 6-3 loss to fellow American Tim Smyczek. —AP

NADAL, FERRER AND THIEM ADVANCE AT RIO OPEN

RIO DE JANEIRO: After an hour-long delay for rain, for his fourth clay-court title. Rafael Nadal advanced to the second round at the Rio Open with 6-1, 6-4 win over fellow Spaniard Pablo Carreno.

Nadal won gold in the Beijing Olympics in 2008 but missed the London Olympics with an injury. Despite being asked about it repeatedly, he's staying away from talking about the Rio's Olympics that open in six months.

'The Olympics is a very important event, a very special one, and I'm going to try my best when the Olympics arrive," Nadal said. "But for now I'm playing the ATP tournament in Rio. That's the most important thing for me." Also advancing Tuesday were No. 2 David Ferrer, who beat Nicolas Jarry of Chile 6-3, 7-6 (3), and No. 5 Dominic Thiem, who had a 6-3, 6-4 win

over Pablo Andujar of Spain. Not much will faze Thiem in this week's Rio Open. He beat Nadal - the king of clay - last week in the semifinals in Buenos Aires, and then won the event

"Both things gave me a lot of confidence, but after the match with Nadal I wanted to give everything to win the tournament," the 22-year-old Austrian said. "The win against Rafa would have been worth only half if I had lost the final."

No. 3 Jo-Wilfried Tsonga had his match rained out against Thiago Monteiro. They will play today. In firstround upsets, Federico Delbonis of Argentina beat sixth-seeded Jack Sock of the United States 7-5, 6-1 and Alexandr Dolgopolov upset No. 8 seed Thomaz Bellucci 6-7 (3), 7-5, 6-2.

On the women's side, top-seeded Teliana Pereira of Brazil lost 6-3, 7-5 to Petra Martic of Croatia, and second-seeded Johanna Larsson of Sweden defeated Lourdes Dominguez Lino of Spain 7-5, 6-4.

Pereira's early loss is a blow for the women's side of the combined WTA-ATP event on outdoor clay. She is only ranked No. 43 but gave local organizers a hometown favorite. — AP

WILLETT KEEN TO MAINTAIN MOMENTUM IN MALAYSIA

seeks further fuel for his rapid rise in world golf at this week's inaugural Maybank Championship Malaysia, where he heads a field including past Major champions Louis Oosthuizen and Martin Kaymer.

Willett arrives in Kuala Lumpur on a tide of momentum following a win two weeks ago in the Dubai Desert Classic and a handful of other top-10 finishes in recent months.

The 28-year-old has soared from 47th a year ago to world number 13 and is the highest-ranked player in a Malaysian field that also features top-50 players Thongchai Jaidee and Kiradech Aphibarnrat of Thailand, and Englishmen Chris Wood and Matthew Fitzpatrick.

Willett showed his championship mettle by clinching a one-shot victory in Dubai with a tricky 15-foot putt on the final hole.

It was his fourth career win and lifted him from 19th in the world rankings to within striking distance of the top 10. Willett admitted he is still acclimating to his new status and that "expectations are obviously high after how well I've been playing recently."

"Winning does take a lot out of you, physically and mentally," he said. But he added that a week off at home in England had left him refreshed.

'RUNNING ON ADRENALINE'

"When you're running on adrenalin, you don't tend to feel the little niggles and the aches and pains that can build up. So it was

KUALA LUMPUR: England's Danny Willett nice to have last week off to recover and recharge the batteries," he said.

The \$3 million tournament at the Royal Selangor Golf Club, co-sanctioned by the European and Asian Tours who are in ongoing talks over a proposed merger into a mega-tour, is the successor to the longtime Malaysian Open, which has been discontinued due to a sponsorship shift.

Both Oosthuizen, now the world number 21, and Kaymer, who is ranked 36, will be trying to bounce back after missing the cut in windy conditions in Dubai.

"I struggled with my ball flight (in Dubai) and when it's windy that's the last thing you want to happen," said Oosthuizen, of South Africa.

The early-year appearance in Malaysia typically offers a special challenge for Western golfers due to the humid conditions and jet lag, and Oosthuizen said Tuesday he was "struggling to stay awake".

But he added that it may be "a good omen", noting that he ended up winning the Malaysian Open in 2012 after rushing in following a playoff at the US Masters against eventual champion Bubba Watson.

Willett, Germany's Kaymer, and others from Europe also are keen to burnish their Ryder Cup credentials in the presence of European captain Darren Clarke of Northern Ireland, who also will be competing in Malaysia.

The \$3 million Maybank Championship Malaysia has a winner's purse of \$500,000 and is co-sanctioned by the Asian Tour and European Tour.— AFP

UEFA OPENS DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS OVER PUTIN TRIBUTE

MOSCOW: UEFA has opened disciplinary proceedings against Lokomotiv Moscow midfielder Dmitri Tarasov for wearing a T-shirt praising Russian President Vladimir Putin after a Europa League match in Turkey.

The 28-year-old Tarasov removed his team jersey at the end of the game against Fenerbahce in Europe's second-tier club competition in Istanbul on Tuesday, revealing a picture of Putin and the words: "The most polite president".

Diplomatic relations between Russia and Turkey soured after a Russian war

plane was shot down by the Turkish Air Force last November.

"This is my president. I respect him and decided to show that I am ready to support him wherever I am. I wrote on this T-shirt everything that I wanted to say," Tarasov said after his side lost 2-0 in the first leg of the last-32 tie.

Lokomotiv described Tarasov's actions a "inexcusable" in a statement on their website (www.fclm.ru).

"Unfortunately, the club's staff were unable to prevent this incident as the footballer had not informed anyone of his plans. What Dmitri did was inappropriate and damages the club's and his own reputation," the club said.

"Tarasov will be fined in accordance with his contract with Lokomotiv." Russian sports news agency R-Sport quoted a UEFA source as saying that Tarasov could be banned for a minimum of 10 matches and that Lokomotiv may also face sanctions.

Igor Lebedev, State Duma Deputy and member of the Russian Football Union's executive committee, criticized Tarasov "You can only say thank you for such a stupid gesture," Lebedev told R-Sport. "I respect him as a footballer but this kind of action is unforgivable for a person of this level. Patriotism is not shown on Tshirts or on pictures...

"A 3-0 victory against Fenerbahce would have been the highest level of patriotism and Tarasov would have been carried out of the stadium by the fans back to Moscow," he added.

European soccer's governing body has taken a very serious stance against politically-motivated incidents at soccer matches in the past. In July 2015, it fined Barcelona 30,000 euros (\$33,438) after their Champions League final victory over Juventus during which the club's supporters displayed banners with calls for Catalonia to gain independence from Spain. In 2013, UEFA fined Celtic 50,000 euros following a Champions League game against AC Milan at which the Glasgow club's fans unveiled a flag showing the image of Scottish national hero William Wallace and Irish Republican hunger striker Bobby Sands. —Reuters

SPRING IN THE AIR AS MLB PITCHERS, CATCHERS REPORT

CHICAGO: The thaw from winter's teeth-chattering cold is underway, perhaps most noticeably for eager Chicago Cubs fans with this week's heartwarming arrival of pitchers and catchers at Major League Baseball spring training camps.

As Arizona Diamondback players report on Wednesday to Salt River Fields at Talking Stick, a half-hour drive from downtown Phoenix, the long-suffering Cubs are the unaccustomed, heavy 4-1 favorites to win the 2016 World Series.

Hope springs eternal with the beginning of spring training in Arizona and Florida, with all teams gearing up to start all level when Major League Baseball's marathon 162-game season opens in April.

For the Cubs and their fans, it seems like an eternity since they ruled the baseball world having not won a World Series since 1908.

With a roster full of young talent including sluggers Anthony Rizzo, Kris Bryant and Kyle Schwarber, and a pitching staff topped by Cy Young winner Jake Arrieta, the Cubs reached the NL Championship Series last year after posting the third best record in the majors.

Determined to snap the longest championship drought in North American professional sports, Cubs general manager Theo Epstein kept busy in the offseason, signing outfielder Jason Heyward and starter John Lackey from division-rival St. Louis and adding superutility player Ben Zobrist.

Following the Cubs in preseason odds were the 2015 NL champion New York Mets and San Francisco Giants, both rated 8-1 choices to win the championship by online betting site Boyada

by online betting site Bovada.

The Los Angeles Dodgers and

Washington Nationals follow at 10-1, with the National League's leading teams all priced ahead of the top American League choices.

The Boston Red Sox, AL East cellar dwellers in 2015, signed free agent starter David Price, who last year helped Toronto reach the postseason for the first time since 1993, and added closer Craig Kimbrel to rate a 12-1 choice with the Blue Jays.

To offset the loss of Price, Toronto expect young starter Marcus Stroman to return from injury to pick up the slack and strong-armed young Aaron Sanchez might join him in the rotation.

Reigning MLB champions the Kansas City Royals did not make major additions but re-signed free agent outfielder Alex Gordon and brought in starter lan Kennedy to compensate for the loss of Johnny Cueto, who signed a free agent deal with the Giants.

Kansas City were rated 16-1 choice to repeat, followed by the up-and-coming Houston Astros at 18-1 while the Yankees were a joint sixth pick at 22-1.

Among teams making offseason splashes were the Diamondbacks, who bolstered their rotation by signing free agent Zack Greinke away from the Los Angeles Dodgers and trading for Shelby

Two other AL Central clubs made bold moves in hopes of challenging the Royals. The Cubs' crosstown neighbors the White Sox beefed up their infield by dealing for second baseman Brett Lawrie and slugging third baseman Todd Frazier, while Detroit added starting pitcher Jordan Zimmermann and outfielder Justin Upton over the winter. — Reuters

EX-NBA PLAYER'S PHILIPPINES LIFE BAN REDUCED

MANILA: Ex-NBA player Ivan Johnson has had his lifetime ban in the Philippines' professional league for a foul-mouthed outburst at an official reduced to one year after he made a personal apology, the league said yesterday.

Ex-Atlanta Hawk Johnson was banished mid-game on Saturday after he used "the f-word" in an argument with Philippine Basketball Association (PBA) commissioner Chito Narvasa.

But after a meeting with the player, who plays with the Talk 'N Text Tropang Texters team, Narvasa reduced the ban to one season, league spokesman

Willie Marcial told AFP. "He apologised, he explained to us... he is really different on the court. He wanted to show he is really a good man," Marcial said of the meeting, where he said Johnson brought along his wife and two children. "I really love my fans in the Philippines," Marcial quoted Johnson,

31, as saying.

The PBA also reduced Johnson's 250,000-peso fine (\$5,600) to 150,000 pesos, Marcial added. The 6ft 8in (2.03 metre) power forward, has had a chequered career, having been suspended for one game earlier this month for fighting with players of an opposing

team. He was also banned for life by the Korean Basketball League in 2010 for making an obscene gesture at a referee. And during an abbreviated 2011-2013 NBA career, he was fined for various altercations with fans and officials. Marcial said: "He (Johnson) knows if he does something again, he will really be finished in the Philippines."

In a post on Twitter, Johnson apologised to Narvasa, adding that "this lifetime ban is truly unfortunate and devastating to me being that I feel at home and most welcomed when playing here in the Philippines." Foreign imports are highly-valued in the bas-

ketball-crazy Philippines where they can play a dominant role in the highlycompetitive PBA. But foreign players can find themselves under a microscope, where they may be penalised for any offence.

Ex-New York Knicks and Denver Nuggets player Renaldo Balkman was banned and fined by the PBA after he choked a teammate in 2013.

Last year, former NBA player Daniel Orton was fired by his own team after he criticised revered Philippines boxing champ Manny Pacquiao for embarking on a professional basketball career. —AFP

BAYERN'S GUARDIOLA SHORT AT THE BACK AS JUVE LOOM

BERLIN: Pep Guardiola acknowledges Bayern Munich has a height problem ahead of their key Champions League clash at Juventus as an injury crisis has left them short at the back-literally. While striker Robert Lewandowski is head and shoulders above his rivals, scoring twice in Sunday's 3-1 win at Augsburg, injuries meant Bayern fielded a back four with an average height of under five foot nine inches (1.75m). "Every team in the world is stronger in the header than we are. It's not an ideal situation," complained Guardiola ahead of next Tuesday's Champions League clash in Turin.

Guardiola has been stripped of centrebacks after Holger Badstuber fractured an ankle in training last Saturday, while Javi Martinez and Jerome Boateng are sidelined long-term by knee and groin injuries. Boateng has said he is on target to meet his goal of returning to training in April, "but I won't set a date to put myself under pressure", while Badstuber is now out of hospital after surgery, but is not expected to play again this season.

"It's a big shock for me, but I can promise everyone I will return," said Badstuber after suffering his fourth serious injury since December 2012. Medhi Benatia is returning from injury, while loan signing Serdar Tasci is lacking conditioning after joining from Spartak Moscow and was concussed in his first training session.

Without a single fit centre-back, Guardiola used Juan Bernat (1.72m) and Philipp Lahm (1.70m) as wing-backs against Augsburg with left-back David Alaba (1.80m) and defensive midfielder Joshua Kimmich (1.74m) paired up at centre-back. In attack, Bayern are scoring goals


for fun through two giants of the game. Lewandowski has 21 goals in 20 league games with 31 in all competitions, while Thomas Mueller has also hit 15 league goals in a total from 22. But Bayern's bosses are concerned about the height of Juve's key forwards Mario Mandzukic (1.87m), Alvaro Morata (1.90m) and Paulo Dybala (1.77m), especially from corners and set piece situations.

"Then we'll just have to stop them jumping higher," joked Bayern's director of sport Matthias Sammer. "They'll have to make their presence felt for crosses, but Philipp, Joshua or Juan are all incredibly savvy." Bayern are desperate to celebrate Guardiola's departure for Manchester City with silverware after exiting the Champions League at the semi-finals stage for the last two seasons under the Spaniard's steerage. But their injury situation could be a blessing in disguise as Guardiola's current back four are all fleet-footed and have their team-mates' trust. Mueller needs no con-

"They are all strong in the tackle, dedicated, fast and have everything you need, maybe except the size of a classic central defender," added the Germany forward.

Bayern host mid-table Darmstadt on Saturday, then Juventus on Tuesday, before two key away German league matches as they look to protect their eight-point lead at Wolfsburg, on February 27, and secondplaced Borussia Dortmund on March 5.

"We need to show plenty of spirit," said Sammer. "We have to be able to prove we can live with playing there (at Wolfsburg and Dortmund). "I'm sure the team will manage it." — AFP

BLANC PRAISES MATCH-WINNER CAVANI, CHELSEA RETAIN HOPE

PARIS: Paris Saint-Germain coach Laurent Blanc heaped praise on Edinson Cavani after the Uruguayan played the role of super-sub to give his side a 2-1 win against Chelsea in their Champions League last 16, first leg.

Cavani replaced Lucas in the 74th minute of Tuesday's game at the Parc des Princes and four minutes later beat Thibaut Courtois with a firsttime finish from an Angel Di Maria assist to ensure the French champions will take a lead to London for the second leg next month.

It was just his second goal of 2016 after a difficult spell which has seen the player signed for a French record transfer fee of 64 million euros (\$71 million; £50 million) from Napoli lose his place as a regular starter.

"Whoever got the second goal I would have been happy and I am happy for Edi. He's a boy who scores goals-we doubt his goal-scoring talents often and then he pops up and shows he can put the ball in the net at any time," said

"He has gone through a very difficult time but I hope the fact he got the goal will be good for him and the team."

It looked like Chelsea would head back across the Channel the happier after Zlatan Ibrahimovic's free-kick opener was cancelled out by the rarest of goals — a poacher's finish by John Obi Mikel right on the stroke of half-time.

Several fine saves by Courtois in the second half thwarted PSG for long spells until Cavani's winner, and now Chelsea will need to score at Stamford Bridge in the return on March 9 if they are to stand a chance of going through. However, away goals have decided the meet-

ings of these clubs in the last two seasons, with Chelsea advancing in the 2014 quarter-finals and Paris going through in the last 16 a year ago despite being held 1-1 at home in the first leg.

"The big regret for me is that we lost the goal just before half-time," said Blanc. "Maybe we need to ask UEFA if it's fair that away goals count double, but tonight we can be happy because we played the way we want to play.

"It is not a very big advantage but in terms of the football we played it's very satisfying."

'NOT DRAMATIC'

PSG kept up their impressive record this season, which now reads just one defeat in 40 matches in all competitions, with that loss coming away to Real Madrid.

In contrast, this was a first defeat for Chelsea in 13 matches since the sacking of Jose Mourinho in December, but their interim coach Guus Hiddink remains upbeat about their chances in the return.

"Of course a defeat is never a good or nice feeling but you have to consider it's a two-leg game and scoring away is always important," said Hiddink, who came to Paris with a reorganised defence in the absence of injured captain John Terry. "We emphasised the importance of defensive organisation but we were dangerous too. Losing 2-1, of course we're still in the race.

"We could have been a little bit more lethal in the four or five counters we made but it is difficult to play them. I am never happy with a loss but it's not a dramatic loss."

The veteran Dutchman, who admitted Terry was a doubt for this weekend's FA Cup fifthround tie against Manchester City, said it was still impossible to name a favourite to go through to the last eight.

"I think it's 50-50 still. Our opponents are a very strong team and that's why I think our performance was very good. "Everyone could see this PSG likes to play football. They are very smart and you must be very alert.

"If you have seen the second goal-this was a typical example of how we prepared them but you cannot do everything well. They have a nose for creating danger."—AFP

BECKENBAUER FINED AND WARNED BY FIFA JUDGES

KLOPP RELISHING

GENEVA: FIFA's ethics committee yesterday sanctioned German football legend Franz Beckenbauer with a warning and a light fine for failing to cooperate with a probe into the bidding for the 2018 and 2022 World Cups.

The investigation into the controversial decisions to award the two tournaments to

Russia (2018) and Qatar (2022) culminated in the now famous 2014 report authored by former US prosecutor Michael Garcia, which FIFA has so far not released, citing procedural reasons.

Beckenbauer "failed to cooperate" with the investigation, "despite repeated requests for his assistance," an ethics committee statement said. The information sought from Beckenbauer included "requests to provide information during an in-person

interview and in response to written questions presented in both English and German," the statement added.

FIFA judges issued a warning to Beckenbauer and fined him 7,000 Swiss francs (\$7,000, 6,350 euros). Beckenbauer, 70, served on the panel that chose the tournament hosts. In June 2014, he was suspended for 90 days for his alleged reluctance to cooperate with the Garcia probe, but that suspension was lifted after two In October, FIFA judges opened an

investigation targeting Beckenbauer, a former FIFA executive committee member, but did not disclose the nature of the

The German national led his country's successful bid for the 2006 World Cup, which has been engulfed by claims that a \$7.2 million payment to FIFA was used to purchase the votes of four members of FIFA's executive committee in 2000 — days before Germany's bid was narrowly approved.

The ethics committee. however, said its investigation of Beckenbauer "did not look into the matters related to the awarding of the 2006 FIFA World Cup to Germany."

The statement from the tribunal noted that Beckenbauer has "subsequently demonstrated a willingness to cooperate." Garcia quit FIFA after compiling his report, claiming that world football's governing body released an erroneous summary of his findings that sought to clear Russia and Qatar of wrongdoing. —AFP

PSG'S LAVEZZI SIGNS FOR HEBEI CHINA FORTUNE CLUB

BEIJING: Paris Saint-Germain's Argentine forward Ezequiel Lavezzi has signed with Hebei China Fortune, his new club said yesterday, making the 30-year-old the latest European-based footballer drawn east by jawdropping sums.

Hebei described him as "the next Maradona" on a verified social media account. It did not disclose a transfer fee, but previous British press reports said Lavezzi would earn 23.5 million pounds (\$33.6 million) over two years. "His arrival will make the team's attack more incisive, we look forward to him showing off his brave spirit," the Chinese club added. Website transfermarkt, which tracks commercial developments in the sport, gave the transfer fee as 5.5 million euros (\$6.1 million). Chinese teams have been splashing their cash in Europe, as wealthy owners embrace President Xi Jinping's vision of the sleeping Asian giant becoming a new footballing heavyweight.

Hebei China Fortune are owned by a Beijing-based developer of industrial parks, founded by billionaire Wang Wenxue.

At the club, Lavezzi will join Ivorian striker Gervinho, who signed for 18 million euros in January, along with Cameroon captain and former Marseille centre-back Stephane Mbia.

Lavezzi joined PSG in 2012 for 30 million euros from Napoli, but has been used mainly as a substitute this season, with just three league starts. The current transfer window shuts on February 26 in China, and has already seen big-money moves by Brazilians Alex Teixeira and Ramires, along with Colombia's Jackson Martinez, to join the cash-flush China Super League. The Chinese transfer fee record has been smashed four times in the current transfer window, culminating in Jiangsu Suning paying Shakhtar Donetsk 50 million euros for Teixeira.



Fans have clamoured for tickets for the round of 32, first-leg clash at the WWK Arena in deepest Bavaria to see Liverpool, who are unbeaten in their six European games under Klopp and buoyed by Sunday's thrashing of

Augsburg received 5,000 applications for just 2,000 away tickets for the Liverpool game, which will be a 26,160 sell-out, with the return leg at Anfield on February 25, just three days before the Reds play Manchester City in the League Cup final.

While he is looking forward to returning home, Klopp is focused on the job in hand. "During the draw, I wasn't thinking 'please let it be a German club'. At that point, I'd only been away for four months," he admitted.

"I'm looking forward to coming to Germany, but it's work and it's not as though

I've been waiting for it. "(For Augsburg) Liverpool would have been an exciting enough draw, without a German coach (being involved).

"The stadium would have already been

Liverpool arrive in Bavaria buoyed by their 6-0 drubbing of Villa which left them eighth in the Premier League. After a mid-season injury glut, Liverpool are getting back to a fully fit squad.

Daniel Sturridge, Philippe Coutinho and Divock Origi all played in the drubbing of Villa after recent injuries. Sturridge, who scored the opener at Villa Park, made his first start since early October, while it was Coutinho's first start since January 5.

Klopp is expected to name a strong side, as Liverpool do not have any games between the two legs after being knocked out of the FA Cup by West Ham earlier this month.



RONALDO, JESE ON TARGET AS REAL BEAT ROMA

ROME: Cristiano Ronaldo hit his 89th Champions League goal while second-half substitute Jese added a late second as Real Madrid took a massive step towards the quarter-finals with a 2-0 win at Roma yesterday.

Real travelled to the Stadio Olimpico looking to exorcise painful memories of losing 2-1 twice in succession to the Giallorossi at this stage of the competition in 2008. After weathering a frustrating first half in which Roma failed to finish off a series of promising attacks, Ronaldo broke the deadlock on 57 minutes when he ran on to Marcelo's chip to beat Wojciech Szczesny with a shot that deflected off Alessandro Florenzi. It was the Portuguese forward's 12th goal in seven games this term.

To their credit, Roma dug deep to claim a share of the spoils and were unlucky not to earn a penalty when Florenzi came down under the studs-up challenge of Dani Carvajal. Even after that decision, the hosts battled

ROME: Cristiano Ronaldo hit his 89th Champions League goal while second-half substitute Jese added a winger Mohamed Salah, only to come up short.

It was inspiring stuff, but dozens of the 55,612 home crowd began leaving their seats five minutes from the finish when Jese flashed a shot across several defenders to beat Szczesny low at his far post.

The victory gives Real a huge advantage ahead of the return leg at the Santiago Bernabeu in three weeks time. Roma coach Luciano Spalletti had deployed a 4-3-1-2 formation which left no space for Bosnian striker Edin Dzeko, although he came on to replace Stephan El Shaarawy after he limped off in the second half.

Diego Perotti, signed in January from Genoa, was the driving force throughout, stealing possession, leading attacks and setting up Salah and El Shaarawy.

Real were restricted to a series of half-chances before the interval, the best of which came from Brazilian left-

back Marcelo when he volleyed Ronaldo's clever lob just wide of Szczesny's far post.

It took only seconds for Roma to threaten after the restart, Salah's pace taking him into the box but Real were able to clear. El Shaarawy did well to run on to a long ball but came off worse when goalkeeper Keylor Navas rushed out to clear. Ronaldo recovered quickly from a sore mouth suffered in a fair shoulder charge to stun the stadium into silence just before the hour.

Lucky to escape the offside call, the Portuguese ran on to Marcelo's lob, turned inside and unleashed a shot that came off Florenzi to leave Szczesny clutching at thin air. Ronaldo looked inspired and he sneaked behind Roma's defence and ran onto Karim Benzema's chip, but his delivery sailed across the goalmouth with no takers. Dzeko replaced El Shaarawy just after the hour and soon after fans were up out their seats when

Radja Nainggolan set up Salah, but the Egyptian could only toe-poke a weak shot at Navas while under pressure.

Salah then dispossessed Marcelo in midfield and his pace took him past Sergio Ramos to fire low across the area, but Raphael Varane produced a timely block.

Roma were keeping the pressure on and when Nainggolan set up Dzeko on the edge of the area, the Bosnian held off his markers to set up William Vainqueur for a 30-yard drive that sailed just wide.

DRAXLER LEADS WOLFSBURG TO 3-2 WIN OVER GENT

GENT: Julian Draxler netted twice as Wolfsburg sealed a 3-2 win at Gent yesterday to leave the Germans on course for the

Champions League quarter-finals.
The 22-year-old scored either side of the break in the last 16, first-leg clash, with Max Kruse also on target, but two late goals from Gent gave the Belgian champions some hope for the return leg on March 8 in Wolfsburg. Draxler was superb at the Ghelamco Arena, having also tormented Manchester United in Wolfsburg's 3-2 win in December in the final round of group matches which condemned Louis van Gaal's Red Devils to the Europa League.

Draxler's Germany team-mate Kruse added Wolfsburg's third on 60 minutes as the Gent defence capitulated and he nearly added a fourth just moments later by hitting the woodwork.

But Wolfsburg, last season's German Cup winners, lost their shape badly after Gent captain Sven Kums scored with 10 minutes to go before Kalifa Coulibaly added a second just before the final whistle.

The Germans were forced into a first-half change when right-back Sebastian Jung succumbed to a leg knock to make way for ex-Chelsea winger Andre Schuerrle.

But persistent pressure from the away side had paid off just before that when Draxler created a superb opening goal.

He showed why Wolfsburg paid 35 million euros (\$39.4m) to sign him from Schalke last August by brilliantly turning Thomas Foket near the left touchline.

Draxler then sprinted away from the defence and played a neat one-two with Vieirinha before slotting the return pass into the bottom right-hand corner on 44 minutes.

Draxler doubled Wolfsburg's lead just after the break when he pounced on a mistake in the Gent defence. The 22-year-old snapped up a loose pass, played the ball between Stefan Mitrovic's legs and chipped Gent's onrushing goalkeeper Matz Sels on 54 minutes. His classy finish took the wind out of the hosts' sails, and Wolfsburg's third followed six minutes later when Christian Traesch's pin-point cross was met in the middle by Kruse, who fired home from close range.

The Wolfsburg striker hit the woodwork two minutes later as the Gent defence again left him in acres of space, but he mistimed his shot. Gent were surprise qualifiers from their group behind winners Zenit St Petersburg, knocking out Valencia and Lyon, and they

Luis Suarez missed a second-half penalty days after famously converting Messi's pass from a spot-kick against Celta Vigo, but made amends with a brilliant finish for Barca's third midway through the second half. Atletico Madrid are Barca's closest challengers with Real

Madrid a further point adrift in third.

The match had been postponed due to Barcelona's commitments in the Club World Cup in December and, with a huge clash against fellow strugglers Real Betis to come on Saturday, Sporting boss and former Barca defender Abelardo Fernandez made nine changes to his side from the team that started Friday's 2-2

draw with Rayo Vallecano.

However, in a match dominated by the European champions, it was the hosts who had the first clear opening as Alex Menendez shot just wide from Barca loanee Alen Halilovic's through ball. Barca coach Luis Enrique also made five changes, but the star front three of Messi, Suarez and Neymar started after their incredible display in the 6-1 thrashing of Celta at the weekend.

Suarez had the first chance to extend his lead as the league's top scorer from Neymar's inch-perfect pass, but the

Luis Enrique's men should have put the game out of sight before half-time as Cuellar flew to his right to prevent Messi from scoring a first-half hattrick before Neymar curled the rebound against the post.

Barca's demolition of Celta in the final half an hour on Sunday was lit up by Messi's decision to pass a penalty into Suarez's path to complete his hat-trick.

And the former Liverpool striker may have regretted not returning the favour as Cuellar dived to his right to save Suarez's spot-kick after the 'keeper had brought down Neymar.

Barca have now missed eight of their 16 penalties this season. However, Suarez made amends with a much harder opportunity 23 minutes from time when his left-footed effort curled in off the far post for his 40th goal of the season. — AFP

AIRBUS, PAL SEAL \$1.85 BILLION DEAL

Philippine Airlines to purchase of six A350-900s

SINGAPORE: European plane-maker Airbus said yesterday it had won a \$1.85 billion deal for the purchase of six A350-900s by Philippine Airlines (PAL), flag-carrier of one of Asia's fastest growing economies. PAL also has the option to purchase an additional six of the aircraft, the two companies announced at the Singapore Airshow.

Separately, PAL also signed a \$600-million order with Rolls-Royce for Trent XWB engines to power the six A350s, the airline said in another statement. PAL president Jaime Bautista said the planes will be used for PAL's non-stop, long-haul flights from the Philippines to the United States, Canada and Europe. The Philippines' economic growth in the past six years under President Benigno

SINGAPORE: European plane-maker Airbus said yesterday it had won a \$1.85 billion deal for the purchase of six A350-900s by Asia, boosting travel demand.

The Philippines also relies on a diaspora of around 10 million Filipinos, or 10 percent of the population, many of them residing in the cities targeted by PAL. The airline plays a key transportation link for millions of Filipinos who work abroad, with a route network tracing the key destinations of the labor diaspora. "We are happy to announce that today we will commit to acquire six A350-900 series which will allow us... to fly non-stop from Manila to New York, allow us to increase our presence in the US, in San Francisco and Los Angeles, and also to Vancouver and Toronto," Bautista told a news conference.

"This aircraft will allow us to improve our operations to Europe, (it) will be used to fly from Manila to London." He added that the aircraft "will really support our mission of becoming a full service five-star airline in five years". Delivery of the aircraft will start in 2018. "The A350s range capability has been an important factor in our decision, enabling us to offer nonstop service on all our premium long-haul routes," Bautista said. The order is worth \$1.85 billion at list prices, although airlines usually get discounts on their purchases.

Border Security business

Meanwhile, Airbus Group no longer plans to sell off its entire defense electronics unit and will instead dispose of just its radar and target recog-

AllIgemeine Zeitung reported yesterday. Citing a letter from management to the employees of Airbus Defense & Space (ADS), the paper said the Border Security business would be retained and operated by Airbus, while the remaining parts of the unit would be sold to an external bidder as planned. Management is citing various delays with its long-standing project partner in Saudi Arabia as a reason for backing out of the sale of the Border Security business, the paper added. Airbus also hopes to take advantage of new opportunities for border security presented by Europe's refugee crisis, the paper said. However this had not explicitly been mentioned in the letter to employees, the paper added, citing a manager. Airbus was not immediately available for

Airbus, Europe's largest aerospace group, is currently selling several businesses to letter from management to the employees of focus its defense division on warplanes, missiles, launchers and satellites.

The group had originally planned to pick a buyer for the defense electronics unit by the end of last year as part of its plan to dispose of assets with combined annual revenues of around 2 billion euros (\$2.2 billion). NIGERIA STRUGGLES AS BUHARI WRANGLES WITH BUDGET, NAIRA

LAGOS: When Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari finally swore in his cabinet in November, nearly six months after taking office, he hoped to shake off his nickname "Baba Go Slow". But troubling errors in the budget of Africa's largest economy and the continuing free fall of the naira on the black market have both Nigerians and investors worried that Buhari still isn't moving fast enough to address a deepening economic crisis. Since its peak in 2014, the global price of oil-which accounted for two-thirds of the Nigerian government's revenue-has plunged by 70 percent, decimating economic growth and the naira.

In response, Buhari announced a record 6 trillion-naira (\$30-billion, 27 billion-euro) budget promising to triple

Policy paralysis

The budget confusion is yet another deterrent for investors already reluctant to invest in the country as a result of Buhari's monetary policies, which have caused a severe dollar shortage and the naira to hit unprecedented lows of 340 against the dollar on the black market. Nigeria has frozen the naira at 197-199 to the dollar for almost a year in a bid to protect the poor, while the government has banned a wide range of importsincluding toothpicks and shovels-to conserve foreign exchange reserves.

The policy has been criticized by international investors, who say pegging the currency and restricting imports is futile and only serves to suffocate growth. Recent pressure from the International Monetary Fund to devalue the currency appears to have been rebuffed by Buhari, who declared last month "I won't kill the naira" and promised the country's economy will "stabilize soon". "Investors aren't confident because there isn't a clear path forward," Rand Merchant Bank Africa analyst Nema Ramkhelawan-Bhana said. "As long as those budget delays are happening it means that the central bank is going to have to do the heavy lifting for the economy," she said, speaking from Johannesburg. "The worst case scenario is policy paralysis, particularly what we've been seeing with the central bank and foreign exchange policy." — AFP

AUB PROFITS RISE 12.9% TO KD 77.7M IN 2015

KUWAIT: Ahli United Bank (Kuwait) announced operating profits from core businesses of the bank rose to KD 77.7 million in 2015, up from KD 68.8 million in 2014, an increase of 12.9 percent over the same period. BEIJING PROMISES ECONOMIC STABILITY AMID UNCERTAINTY

COMMERCE MINISTRY DOWNPLAYS RISK OF CAPITAL FLIGHT

BEIJING: Chinese policymakers emerged from the Lunar New Year hiatus with one collective message for nervous investors at home and abroad - Beijing will put a floor under the slowing economy, keep its currency steady and ensure employment remains stable even as bloated industries undergo restructuring. The string of assurances comes ahead of two highprofile political events for China: a meeting of G20 finance chiefs in Shanghai later this month and next month's annual gathering of China's legislature - where the next five-year economic development plan will be finalized.

A rout in Chinese stocks last summer and its unexpected devaluation of the yuan in August have rattled global markets, raising concerns about the health of the world's second-largest economy and Beijing's ability to steer it simultaneously through both a protracted slowdown and radical restructuring. "China's economic fundamentals have not changed," Zhao Chenxin, a spokesman for the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC), the country's top economic planner, told reporters in Beijing on Wednesday. "The economy will maintain a medium- to high-rate growth."

"China's status as the world's largest holder of foreign exchange reserves has not changed, the large-scale trade surplus has not changed and the steady progress in the yuan internationalization has not changed," Zhao said. Still, gross domestic product expanded 6.9 percent in 2015, the slowest in a quarter of a century, and economists see a further cooling this year even if the government expands its year-long stimulus campaign. "We think growth could be 6.7-6.8 percent this year," said Xu Gao, chief economist of China Everbright Securities in Beijing.

"The risk of a hard landing is not big. The risk of a hard landing may come from improper government policies. If policies are right, the

The NDRC plans to allocate 400 billion yuan (\$61.3 billion) to fund local governments' infrastructure projects, a local branch of the economic planner said in a statement before the long Lunar New Year break. The economic planner said yesterday that it had okayed 54.1 billion yuan of investments in

"After the Lunar New Year, the cabinet and government ministries have all sent out positive signals," said Xu at China Everbright Securities. "For the economy, there is still lots of room for the government to step up investment. 2016 is the first year of the 13th five-year plan (2016-2020) and the government will ensure growth of at least 6.5 percent this year." NDRC's Zhao also said China has the ability and confidence to maintain stable employment levels, even as the government moves to curb overcapacity in the coal and steel sectors to squeeze out so-called "zombie firms". The government will take steps to resolve factory overcapacity but will try to reduce the number of layoffs, he said.

China's plan to cut its steel production capacity by 100-150 million tons will lead to the loss of up to 400,000 jobs, the official Xinhua news agency reported last month. And while most private economists agree the economy does not appear to be in danger of sharp deterioration at present, most are sticking to forecasts of a gradual and bumpy slowdown. "We expect the economy to continue to slow and corporate balance sheets to worsen," Tao Wang, Hong Kongbased China economist at UBS, wrote in a report on Monday. "However, we see the risk of an immediate systematic financial crisis as very small, due to high domestic saving and ample banking liquidity, extensive government ownership of banks and many debtors, and capital contempered fears of an imminent trols."—Reuters

JAPAN'S AUTOMAKER UNIONS' PAY **DEMANDS CHALLENGE ABENOMICS**

TAIPEI: Taiwan's economy is looking at another gloomy year ahead as the government yesterday cut growth forecasts in the face of subdued international demand for exports. The growth prediction for 2016 has been slashed from 2.32 percent to 1.47 percent after a worse-than-expected 2015 saw the island sink into recession at the end of the year. "This year's global economic growth rate will be slightly higher than last year's, but growth momentum will remain slow as in recent years," the Directorate General of Budget, Accounting and Statistics said in a statement.

TAIWAN SIGNALS GLOOM

WITH LOWERED FORECAST

The pessimistic forecast comes the day after Taiwan's finance ministry said shipments for January had slumped 13 percent year-on-year in the longest consecutive period of decline since 2009. Among the hardest-hit areas is electronics-the biggest category of exports for Taiwan, traditionally a technology manufacturing hub. A number of leading Taiwanese firms such as Foxconn and TSMC are among Apple's suppliers. Last year saw Taiwan's shipments fall by a tenth compared to the previous year. Exports in 2016 are expected to contract another 2.78 percent, the statistics bureau said yesterday, as rising homegrown tech brands and hardware manufacturers in China put pressure on Taiwan's industries. The island's steel, petrochemical, and mechanical exports also face stiff competition from China. Official figures released yesterday revised down 2015 full-year economic growth from 0.85 percent to 0.75 percent. The government late last year sought to boost consumer spending-the other key economic indicator-through a stimulus package that lasts until the end of this month. But the consumer subsidies appear to have had limited impact as the 2016 domestic consumption growth forecast was also lowered for the year to 1.36 percent. —AFP

IRAN RESISTS CURBS ON OIL OUTPUT

ANKARA: Iran said yesterday it would resist any plan to restrain its oil output as fellow OPEC ministers tried to persuade the country to join the first global oil pact in 15 years. Talks in Tehran between Iranian oil minister Bijan Zanganeh and his counterparts from Iraq, Qatar and Venezuela began yesterday. Iran is the major obstacle to the first joint OPEC and non-OPEC deal since 2001, having pledged to increase output sharply to regain market share lost during years of

The meeting in the Iranian capital followed a deal reached on Tuesday by OPEC power Saudi Arabia and non-OPEC Russia, the world's top two producers and exporters, to freeze production at January levels if other big oil nations agree to join. OPEC Gulf producers -Oatar, Kuwait and the UAE - as well as Venezuela said they would join the pact, aimed at tackling a growing oversupply and helping prices recover from their lowest in over a decade. "Asking Iran to freeze its oil production level is illogical ... when Iran was under sanctions, some countries raised their output and they caused the drop in oil prices." Iran's OPEC envoy, Mehdi Asali, was quoted as saying by the Shargh daily newspaper yesterday.

"How can they expect Iran to cooperate now and pay the price?" he said. "We have repeatedly said that Iran will increase its crude output until reaching the pre-sanctions production level." The freeze plan has so far failed to push up oil prices, due to concerns Iran would not participate and that a deal would do little to ease the global glut as it would still allow Russia and Saudi Arabia to keep pumping at near record levels. Venezuelan Oil Minister Eulogio Del Pino, Iragi Oil Minister Adel Abdel Mahdi and Qatari Energy Minister Mohammad bin Saleh Al-Sada sat down with Zanganeh

The sanctions, imposed over Iran's nuclear program, were lifted last month after an agreement with world powers, allowing Tehran to resume selling oil freely in international markets. Iran exported around 2.5 million barrels per day (bpd) of crude before 2012, but sanctions cut that to around 1.1 million bpd. Tehran has pledged to raise supply by around 1 million bpd in the next 6-12 months.

Special terms

This would only add to the global glut, which has been fuelled by US shale output and a decision by Saudi Arabia to pump at full capacity to drive highercost producers out of the market. The world is already producing more than 1 million bpd than it consumes, with oil stockpiles at record levels. As a result, prices fell below \$30 per barrel in January from as high as \$115 in mid-2014, hammering the finances of Russia, Saudi Arabia and other producers.

Brent oil futures rose 3 percent yesterday after losing as much as 4 percent the day before. "A freeze is not the same as a cut, and somewhat disingenuously, keeping crude production at January levels actually implies higher-thanexpected annual output ... and so can hardly tackle the current market oversupply," JBC Energy said in a note. Two non-Iranian sources close to the OPEC discussions told Reuters on Tuesday that Iran might be offered special terms as part of an output freeze deal. "Iran is returning to the market and needs to be given a special chance, but it also needs to make some calculations," said one

The sources did not elaborate on the special terms, which could be anything from setting limited production increases to linking future output rises to a recovery in oil prices. But Tehran-based oil analyst Reza Zandi said it would be difficult to persuade Tehran to agree to any restraints as there was a broad consensus among senior Iranian officials to increase production to pre-sanctions levels. "Freezing the output is against Iran's national and economic interests, Zanganeh cannot accept it," he said. "The establishment has decided so.'

Olivier Jakob from Petromatrix consultancy said that if Saudi Arabia were to freeze output at January levels, the kingdom would need to cut exports by 0.5 million bpd in the summer months, when it burns more oil for power generation at home. "The production freeze can therefore be seen as an un-official

way for Saudi Arabia to make some room for the restart of the Iranian exports," he said. The last global deal in 2001 saw Saudi Arabia persuade Mexico, Norway and Russia to contribute to production cuts, although Moscow did not follow through and raised exports instead. —Reuters

DISCONTENT BREWS IN GREENHOUSES OF THE 'EUROPE'S VEGETABLE GARDEN

houses in southeastern Spain, dubbed "Europe's vegetable garden", discontent is growing among farmers who complain large supermarket chains do not pay enough and farm workers who live in poverty. Since the 1980s, one of the largest concentrations of greenhouses in the world has developed on a coastal plain near the city of Almeria, spanning over 30,000 hectares in a "sea of plastic" seen from space.

The region is so dry and barren that it was used to film dozens of "spaghetti western" films in the 1960s but with the advent of hydroponic systems that drip-feed fertilisers into grow-bags it now produces several tonnes of fruits and vegetables annually. After decades of rapid development, though, export growth has stalled and growing numbers of people question the viability of this agricultural model. "We produce over 65 percent of the tomatoes, 80 percent of the cucumbers and 94 percent of the eggplants sold in Europe," said Francisco Vargas, the head of the ASAJA young farmers' association.

"But look at the prices we are paid. They are below production costs." He blames a war between large retailers who try to hold on to clients by offering lowest possible prices. "Multinationals are strangling us," said Miguel Rubio, 60, who struggles to make ends meet with the produce he grows on four hectares of land in the "sea of plastic". He said farmers were forced to boost output because of the low prices paid by chains to try to make more money, which in turn creates bigger surpluses and pushes prices down even further. "The system makes no sense," said Rubio.

'Last link in chain'

Antonio Fernandez, meanwhile, talked with pride of the "sweet taste" of the red peppers he produces that are exported to northern Europe, and the progress made in recent years to reduce the use of pesticides. "But the price of everything increases-plastic sheets, seeds, power- except the price paid by supermarkets for produce," he said as water drip-dropped in the background from his automatic irrigation system. Over 1,000 farmers protested in Almeria on February 4 to demand a "fair" price for their fruits and vegetables and allow them to work "with dignity".

But with profit margins squeezed, some farms have started exploiting staff that work in the greenhouses,

ALMERIA: In a vast sea of plastic green- mainly legal and illegal immigrants from Africa and Eastern Europe who toil as day workers, said University of Almeria anthropologist Francisco Checa. At night, they stream out of the greenhouses on their bikes, back to the packed, basic homes they share with other workers. "I work 25 days a month but on my pay slip only 10 days are recorded," said Adama, a 34-year-old from Mali who has worked in the greenhouses since 2008. He said he was owed two months wages but was reluctant to complain-even though he has legal status in Spain-out of fear that his bosses would fire his colleagues who are in the country illegally. Most bosses do not pay farm workers overtime and they ignore a collective labour agreement that sets wages for day workers at 46 euros (\$51) for eight hours of work, Checa said. The provincial branch of the SAT workers' union receives daily complaints from farm laborers, many of whom live in two shanty towns located near the greenhouses.

'One-off cases'

Tensions between Spanish residents and immigrant workers boiled over in the region in 2000 after a Spanish woman was stabbed to death, sparking clashes in the farming town of El Ejido. "Conditions of pure exploitation of immigrants have since worsened," said Spitou Mendy, the spokesman for SAT in the province of Almeria. Mohamed, a 32-year-old Moroccan who studied economics before crossing illegally into Spain, lives in a shack made of wood and plastic with other farm workers in one of the shanty towns near the greenhouses. "I earn 35 euros for eight hours of work, but others only get 30 euros," he said.

Farmers and officials, however, say cases of abuse are not the norm. "These are one-off cases, not at all the general situation of the 60,000 greenhouse workers," said Jose Antonio Aliaga, chief of agricultural services in Almeria for the regional government. Fernandez, the farmer who exports red peppers, said "it is not fair to say that all farmers here are seen as slave drivers." The Romanian couple he employees describe him as a model boss who pays them a monthly salary of 800 euros for five days a week of work and provides them with free accommodation in a house with a garden. But for the anthropologist Checa, it is all due to the slim margins earned by farmers. "Growers can only put pressure on the last link in the chain," he said. —AFP

SLUMBERING PAKISTANI STEEL GIANT SHOWS WHY SELL-OFFS ARE STALLED

MILLS' PLIGHT HIGHLIGHTS PAKISTAN PRIVATIZATION STRUGGLES

KARACHI: Once the producer of almost half the country's steel needs, state-owned Pakistan Steel Mills' (PSM) cavernous factory buildings on the outskirts of Karachi stand eerily still. A 4.5 km-long conveyor belt that once carried coal from the nearby port is idle and blast furnaces rest silent. Birds build nests in Soviet-era equipment and stray dogs nap outside abandoned plants.

The company is for sale, but the government cannot find a buyer as it struggles to get privatizations back on track after a series of setbacks. A glance at PSM's finances may explain why. The company has \$3.5 billion in debt and accumulated losses, loses \$5 million a week and has not produced steel at its 19,000-acre facility since June last year. That was when the national gas company cut power supplies, demanding payment of bills of over \$340 million. Like many Pakistani industrial firms, political meddling and competition from cheaper Chinese imports left PSM vulnerable.

They also undermine Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's promise to the International Monetary Fund to privatize PSM by March, in return for a \$6.7 billion national bailout loan agreed in 2013. More than 14,000 jobs are at risk, while the Pakistani economy needs industrial growth to provide employment for a growing population. "Nine billion rupees (\$86 million) are immediately needed to see the company through to June," company CEO Zaheer Ahmed Khan told Reuters at its sprawling premises. "It's really sad, it's a national asset. We are a nuclear power but what does it say that we can't operate a small steel

Privatization pains

The government has injected \$2 billion into PSM since a failed selloff in 2006, but cannot invest more capital, Privatization Commission Chairman Mohammad Zubair said. "The best option is to privatize so that private sector buyers inject capital to upgrade the plant and machinery, buy raw material and so on," he said. PSM is one of several firms Pakistan wants to sell to revive loss-making entities that cost the government \$5 billion a year.

But it has struggled to restructure bleeding companies, including PSM and Pakistan International Airlines (PIA), and get them in shape for potential buyers. This month, Pakistan shelved plans to privatize power supply companies, and officials said Islamabad told the IMF it would not meet deadlines to sell PIA or PSM. While the loss-making firms are a drain on Pakistan's resources around an eighth of the governduce a basic building block for the future. Across the site, signs implore workers to believe steel will make Pakistan stronger. The firm's motto is "Yes, I can." The facility has the capacity to expand to produce 3 million tons of cold and hot-rolled steel annually, against today's 1.1 million tons, CEO Khan said. At 3 million tons, PSM would become "very profitable". But managers failed to upgrade machinery, losses spiraled and production tumbled 92 percent in the past decade as demand for steel tanked during the 2008 recession and cusgroup of Sindh officials visited the site this year, the CEO said. They left with financial feasibility documents but never called back. Zubair, the privatization chairman, said if the Sindh government refused to take over, he would re-start the privatization process.

Unpaid, still working

Privatization would be contentious: this month, protests against the sale of PIA turned violent. PSM employees, half of whom live on the site in a residential complex complete with hospital and

ment's fiscal revenues last year - few fear Pakistan will slide into economic crisis. The IMF has continued to release installments of its 2013 bailout package despite missed targets, and Pakistan is exploring other sources of support, like ally China which plans to invest \$46 billion in a new economic corridor.

Back in the USSR

Designed and funded by the Soviet Union in the 1970s, PSM was once the pride of the nation, showcasing a rapidly industrializing Pakistan with the means to protomers turned to cheaper Chinese products.

International buyers show little interest. Officials close to the government's privatization agenda said suitors offered barely \$100 million for PSM against an expected \$900 million. "You have the land and ... infrastructure but it doesn't have the machinery," said Arif Habib, a businessman whose conglomerate bid for the company a decade ago but would not touch it now. With no takers, the federal government wants the cash-strapped provincial government in Sindh to take over. A cricket stadium, haven't been paid for five months. But pride and few alternatives mean most spend their days at the plant, repairing and chatting. At sunset, the remaining 7,000 workers pile into buses for homes in Karachi, a teeming port city over an hour away. Mohammad Taqi, who has worked at the plant for 38 years, still turns up every day. "I've spent so many years here that I just pray that it will start working again," Taqi said, next to silent, towering blast furnaces. "This place used to be alive. I just want things to be the same again." —Reuters

GERMAN POWER GIANT RWE SUSPENDS DIVIDEND PAYOUTS AFTER ANNUAL LOSS

FRANKFURT: RWE, Germany's second-biggest power supplier, said yesterday it will partially suspend dividend payouts after running up a loss in 2015 as a result of collapsing wholesale prices and weak profitability in the conventional power generation. The announcement sent RWE shares into a nosedive on the Frankfurt stock exchange, where they were the biggest losers, plunging 10.6 percent to an intraday low of 10.55 euros in a generally firmer market.

Germany's power suppliers have been hit in recent years by government plans to eliminate nuclear power by the next decade and champion a so-called "energy transition" away from fossil fuels such as coal towards renewable energy sources such as the wind and the sun. Power utilities have complained that the cost of having to close down their nuclear power plants and the heavy subsidies afforded to renewable energy have pushed them deeply into the red. RWE said in a statement it booked a net loss of 200 million euros (\$223 million) in 2015 compared with net profit of 1.7 billion euros a year earlier.

The loss was due to a writedown of 2.1 billion euros on its power plants in Germany and Britain, RWE explained. "The continued collapse of wholesale electricity prices came to bear, leading to an erosion of power plant margins," RWE said in a statement. "The prospects in the conventional power generation business have worsened further." Adjusted for one-off effects, net profit amounted to 1.1 billion euros, at the lower end of forecasts, and underlying or operating profit totaled 3.89 billion euros, RWE said. In the wake of the "unusually weak" bottom-line earnings, the management board "has decided to propose ... a suspension of the dividend payment to holders of common shares for fiscal 2015," RWE said.

Holders of preferred shares would still receive a payout of 0.13 euros per share. "The backdrop is the recent dramatic deterioration of the earnings prospects of conventional power generation," RWE said. "In light of the current economic prospects of conventional power generation, we reached a decision concerning the dividend today that did not come easily to us. We know that we might disappoint many shareholders. However, it is necessary in order to strengthen our company," said chief executive Peter Terium.

Profits down this year

Looking ahead to the current year, RWE said it is penciling in adjusted net profit of 500-700 million euros. "This represents a considerable decline compared to 2015," the group said. "Besides the erosion of margins in conventional power generation, the absence of the positive special items recorded last year also comes to bear," it said. RWE vowed to "tackle the operating and technical problems in the UK supply business with resolve, but anticipates burdens in this area again in 2016." Net debt and headcount at group level were "unlikely to change significantly compared to 2015," it said. In December, RWE announced plans to spin off its renewables, grids and retail operations and take the unit public. Bigger rival E.ON is similarly splitting its conventional and renewable energies operations into separate entities. —AFP

Mood swings

In commodity markets, oil was whipsawed after top exporters, Russia and Saudi Arabia, agreed to freeze output levels but said the deal was contingent on other producers joining in. After falling sharply at first, prices recouped some ground early yesterday. Brent added 37 cents to \$32.55, while US crude was up 20 cents at \$29.24 a barrel. "Albeit mostly symbolic, it is one of the first clear acknowledgements by the oil heavyweights that all is not entirely well in the current price environment," wrote Helima Croft, global head of commodity strategy at RBC Capital Markets.

"Additionally it signals a potential will-

ingness to be more proactive later in the year. It puts the ball back in the court of those who would not or could not comply." Markets now await minutes of the Federal Reserve's last meeting to judge the balance of opinion among policymakers on the prospect of further rate hikes. Boston Fed President Eric Rosengren certainly sounded in no hurry to tighten. Speaking late on Tuesday, Rosengren said the Fed would need to ratchet down economic forecasts it made in December because of the uncertain global outlook.

Doubts about the pace of any further hikes kept the US dollar restrained at 96.720 against a basket of currencies. It slipped against the yen to 113.73 yen, though it has support around 113.60. The euro also gained 0.2 percent to \$1.1165. The big loser was sterling, which has struggled so far in 2016 because of worries the UK might leave the euro-zone. Traders said UK markets face a pivotal week ahead of a two-day summit starting on Thursday at which Prime Minister David Cameron will try to persuade other leaders to support a deal to keep Britain in the European Union. Sterling was stuck at \$1.4290, having shed 1 percent against the dollar on Tuesday. — Reuters

GOLD STEADIES NEAR \$1,200 AS EQUITY JITTERS SUBSIDE

LONDON: Gold steadied near \$1,200 Federal Reserve's latest policy meeting an ounce yesterday, rolling back earlier week. Uncertainty over the outlook for global equities and for US monetary policy kept the metal underpinned, however. Spot gold was at \$1,201.69 an ounce at 1020 GMT, up 0.1 percent but off an earlier high of \$1,212.20. US gold futures for April delivery were down 0.5 percent at \$1,202.40.

Spot prices peaked at \$1,260.60 an ounce last week after rallying \$200 in less than a month. "It was unusual to see that intensity of that run-up higher," Mitsubishi precious metals analyst Jonathan Butler said. "Gold was pretty overbought on a short-term relative strength index basis." "Once we saw the slight uptick in the dollar over the last couple of days, and equity markets started to get a bit of a bid again, the natural thing was for this safe-haven trade to start to unwind."

Oil and stocks steadied yesterday as investors looked forward to less volatile trading, a day after world equities recorded one of their biggest rallies in years and oil prices swung in a 10 percent range. Investors will be closely watching the minutes of the

for clues on the expected pace of US gains, as a rise in European stocks rate hikes this year. Speculation has pointed to a retreat in the risk aversion increased in recent days that the US that drove prices to one-year highs last central bank might resort to negative interest rates to stimulate the economy after Fed Chair Janet Yellen said last week it was an option that would not be taken "off the table".


OIL RISES AS OUTPUT TALKS TURN TO IRAN

LONDON: Oil prices rose yesterday as efforts led by Russia and Saudi Arabia to broker a deal to freeze production levels and ease a global glut turned to Iran, which signaled a tough line. Iranian Oil Minister Bijan Zanganeh was due to meet his counterparts from Venezuela, Iraq and Qatar at 1030 GMT in Tehran. An Iranian official earlier said Iran would continue increasing its crude output until it reached levels seen before the imposition of international sanctions.

"Asking Iran to freeze its oil production level is illogical," Iran's OPEC envoy, Mehdi Asali, was quoted as saying by the Shargh newspaper. A freeze in production from the near-record levels in January would do little to relieve the glut, analysts said. "The market needs a cut, not a production freeze," said PVM analyst David Hufton. Brent crude was up 92 cents at \$33.10 a barrel by 1105 GMT, after settling down \$1.21 in the previous session. US crude rose 68 cents to \$29.72 a barrel.

Under a proposal that could lead to the first global oil production deal in 15 years, major producers would freeze their output at January levels. But Saudi Arabia said on Tuesday the deal depended on the cooperation of other big producers. Iran, the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries' fourth-largest producer, might be offered an exception as it seeks to ramp up production following the removal of sanctions over its nuclear program last month, said Ildar Davletshin, analyst at Renaissance Capital. Moves to freeze output at January levels will make little difference to the overall supplydemand balance this year and not be enough to clear the 600,000 barrels per day surplus projected for the year, analysts at FGE said in a note.

"It could pave the way for further action to be taken should the likes of Saudi Arabia, other OPEC members and Russia deem it necessary," FGE said. Still, a deal would signal a change in Saudi Arabia's stand. "The deal doesn't add much to rebalance the market, but it is still important that the parties talk. The Saudis are no longer saying they are fighting for market share but that they are ready to discuss a deal," Davletshin said. Investors are also eyeing US oil inventory data today for further direction on prices, with a poll of analysts suggesting a gain of 3.9 million barrels in crude oil stocks last week. — Reuters



LOST IN TRANSLATION: WAL-MART STUMBLES HARD IN BRAZIL

CAMPO GRANDE: When Wal-Mart Stores Inc first expanded into Brazil's midwestern farm-belt city of Campo Grande seven years ago, the economy was booming and executives were eager to open stores even in subprime locations on one-way streets heading out of town. It didn't last. At the end of December, the US retailer closed both of its Maxxi brand cash-and-carry stores in Campo Grande as part of a restructuring that shuttered 60 locations across Brazil, including some Supercenters.

Shoppers said the stores could not compete on assortment, price or location. "It was never clear who Maxxi was for. It wasn't cheap enough for the poor. But there was no appeal for the middle class," said Ordecy Gossler, 40, a public accountant filling his cart with cleaning supplies and toilet paper at Atacad,, o, a rival chain run by France's Carrefour. "When they announced in December that both Maxxis were closing, no one in my office knew where they were."

Today, Wal-Mart has just one Supercenter left in this city of 850,000 people, whose demographic of thrifty shoppers had once seemed suited to the world's largest retailer. It shuttered the city's other one at the end of the year, as traffic dwindled in the shopping mall it was meant to anchor. The retreat from Campo Grande is emblematic of Wal-Mart's broader issues in Brazil, a once-red-hot destination for foreign retailers and other companies that has turned stone cold. And the lackluster performance in Latin America's largest economy shows how tactics that helped Wal-Mart build success in the US sometimes get badly lost in translation overseas.

International results have been anemic, despite \$22 billion in capital investment over the past five years. Wal-Mart last year generated a 4.5 percent operating profit margin from international markets, well below the 7.4 percent return posted from the US. Seeking higher returns, Wal-Mart CEO Doug McMillon in October announced a strategic review of the company's global assets. Some securities analysts have speculated Wal-Mart could exit Brazil, as well as other markets in Latin America where it is already closing an additional 55 stores. The pullback in Brazil also has some worrying echoes of previous Wal-Mart debacles overseas, including South Korea and Germany, two markets it abandoned in 2006.

Labor problems

Brazil in particular has been dogged by poor locations, inefficient operations, labor troubles and uncompetitive prices — with some of the problems baked in during an aggressive, decade-long growth surge, according to interviews with a dozen former and current Wal-Mart executives, as well as analysts, shoppers and store employees. Wal-Mart would not comment on financial results from Brazil ahead of the company's quarterly earnings on Feb. 18. People familiar with the numbers told Reuters that Wal-Mart has posted operating losses in Brazil for each of the past seven years. Jo Newbould, a spokeswoman for the retailer, said the store closures were part of its efforts to "actively manage" its global assets and that it has been working to lower costs in Brazil. David Cheesewright, head of Wal-Mart's international operations, said in an interview that it has no plans to quit Brazil. He pointed to the company's decision to invest in completing an integration of legacy computer systems into the wider Wal-Mart platform as evidence of a commitment to the market. "That's not the act of someone who is packing up the firm for other purposes," he said. Cheesewright expressed optimism about a turnaround. "It's a market that has always been high on potential, but has been a roller-coaster ride in terms of its performance," he said. "It happens to be on a downturn at the moment, and I'm sure it will do what it always has done, which is improve."

Runaway growth

Wal-Mart first entered Brazil in 1995 and grew in measured steps for nearly a decade. That changed in 2004-2005, when it spent about \$1 billion to buy two retailers, Bompreco SA Supermercados do Nordeste and Sonae Distribuicao Brasil S. The deals expanded Wal-Mart's operations into the northeast and south of Brazil, and marked the beginning of a spending spree aimed at building a national footprint. With the takeovers came an array of brands: Wal-Mart currently operates under nine different store banners in Brazil.

At the height of the expansion, former Wal-Mart executives said, a land rush mentality took hold. Brazil's thriving economy in those years convinced executives the biggest risk lay in moving too slowly. In response, they approved new store sites based on increasingly rosy forecasts of future sales. "Most executives didn't have the voice to say, 'Don't open this store; let's not approve more stores," a former finance executive recalled. "Why not? Because Brazil was the new country. We needed to put investment in before others do." In a six-year stretch through the fiscal year ending January 2013, Wal-Mart doubled its locations, reaching nearly 560 at its peak. The rapid expansion strained Wal-Mart's logistics-traditionally one of its strong points in the US but a drag on performance in Brazil.

In some cases, delivery trucks drove days to reach distant stores from centrally located warehouses. Executives from headquarters bickered with those running some kinds of stores about who should bear the distribution costs, the former finance executive said. Amid the focus on growth, executives never fully integrated the legacy information systems from BompreÁo and Sonae. Disruptions in communication between headquarters and the many different store types allowed inefficiencies to take root. Buyers, for instance, found themselves using three laptops, one each for the two legacy systems and another for the Wal-Mart platform, people familiar with the matter said.—Reuters

In brief

British unemployment holds at ten-year low

LONDON: Britain's unemployment rate remains at its lowest level in a decade, official data showed yesterday. Unemployment stood at 5.1 percent in the three months to December, unchanged from the three months to November, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) said in a statement. That was the lowest rate, or proportion of the workforce that are unemployed, since October 2005. The jobless total meanwhile sank 172,000 to 1.69 million people in the final quarter of last year compared with a year earlier. The ONS added that more than 31.4 million people are in work, which is the highest level since records began in 1971. Average weekly wages, including bonuses, rose by 1.9 percent in the year to December, down 0.2 percentage points from the previous month. "December's UK labor data continued to paint a mixed picture," said ING economist James Smith. "On the one hand, the unemployment rate remained at 5.1 percent, which ... continues to signal that the labor market remains tight. "More importantly though, wages pressures continue to remain subdued."

'Bad bank' deal could be option for some nations

FRANKFURT: A state-backed "bad bank" that would take over non-performing loans from a country's banks, as has been agreed for Italy, could also be an option for other countries, the head of Europe's new banking resolution authority said yesterday. "Italy has come up with a construction for a bad bank that uses a market solution without state aid," the head of the Single Resolution Board, Elke Koenig, told the business daily Handelsblatt in an interview. "But Italy isn't alone with this problem. In other countries, too, a large amount of non-performing loans has also amassed," Koenig said. The solution reached in Italy "could also be suitable for many other countries," she added, pointing out that "Germany has also had good experience" with such a solution. Last month, the European Union and Italy reached agreement on creating a guarantee vehicle to help Italian banks sell bad loans. Rome had spent more than a year thrashing out a solution with Brussels, having to ensure that any deal would not contravene EU rules on state aid.

Indian conglomerate Mahindra Group to build a plant for the assembly of its M777 Ultra Lightweight Howitzer artillery guns that it wants to sell to India. India and the United States, where BAE manufactures the weapons, are in advanced-stage talks for the sale of 145 M777s in a deal expected to be worth more than \$700 million. New Delhi is trying to replenish its range of artillery weapons after years of delays in ordering new equipment for depleted supplies. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has vowed to upgrade the country's military hardware, but wants deals with foreign companies to include the setting up of factories and plants in India to boost local industry, and the transfer of technology. Under the proposal, Mahindra will run an assembly, integration and testing facility for the 145 Howitzers, BAE said in a statement.

Bahrain lifts bond re-tap to \$750 m

DUBAI: Bahrain has upsized and launched a \$750 million, two-part bond re-opening, at the tighter end of its previous guidance, a document from lead arrangers showed. The kingdom increased its borrowing size by \$250 million on the back of strong demand with the order book topping \$1.35 billion, it said in a document released late on Tuesday. The finances of the small energy exporter, with less generous oil and financial reserves than its neighbors, have been hard hit by the drop in oil prices. A re-tap at start of the year is seen as a positive for Bahrain, as it will potentially save the kingdom from paying much higher interest rates. Increased debt issuance this year by other Gulf governments and companies may squeeze liquidity, in addition to the risk of another US interest rate rise. Bahrain launched its re-tap on Tuesday, split between five-and 10-year portions, at 5.70 percent and 7.40 percent respectively. Previous guidance was 5.70-5.80 percent and 7.40-7.50 percent. Initial price thoughts were set on Tuesday at the 5.875 percent area for the five-year tranche and the 7.5 percent area for the 10-year tranche.



Boeing, Okay Airways sign \$1.3 billion deal

SINGAPORE: Boeing said yesterday it has won a commitment from China's Okay Airways to buy 12 aircraft from the 737 family in a deal worth 1.3 billion. The deal is subject to the approval of the Chinese government and will be posted on Boeing's list of orders once the green light is given, the US aircraft maker said at the Singapore Airshow. Okay Airways, a privately owned airline with headquarters in Beijing, committed to buy eight 737 MAX 8s, three 737 MAX 9s and one next generation 737-900 extended range version. The Chinese carrier also has the option to order another eight 737 MAX 8s, Boeing said. "We greatly value the ties we have built over the years with Boeing," said Okay Airways chairman Wang Shusheng. He said the additional orders "will modernize our fleet and ensure we operate the most efficient fleet well into the future". The order is a boost to the 737 MAX 9, which has been outsold by the A321 neo, its rival narrow body aircraft made by Europe's Airbus. According to an analysis by industry publication Flightglobal before yesterday's announcement, airlines have ordered 224 737 MAX 9s compared with 1,111 A321neos.

NISSAN TO ASSEMBLE CARS IN MYANMAR

YANGON: Japanese auto giant Nissan will start assembling cars in Myanmar for the first time this year, the company said yesterday, as it expands its presence in one of Asia's final economic frontiers. Foreign companies have piled into the Southeast Asian nation since reforms began in 2011, eager to tap into a 51.5 million-strong pool of potential customers. Nissan said production will start in a factory run with a Malaysian partner, Tan Chong Motor Group, before eventually moving to a new facility in Bago, 80 kilometers northeast of the commercial hub Yangon.

The Japanese company announced its plan to build the largest automobile manufacturing site in Myanmar three years ago. Two hundred employees will receive training in Malaysia for a Myanmar assembly line that aims to turn out 10,000 units, according to a Nissan statement. It was not immediately clear if all the vehicles would be destined for the domestic market or whether some were intended for export. "Nissan is pleased to have the opportunity to be part of new motoring growth in Myanmar," said company vice-president

Huge import taxes and international sanctions aimed at the previous regime meant vehicles were too expensive for most people, but recent changes have seen a sharp increase in demand for four wheels. Evidence of the former pariah state's exploding car market lies on its once-sleepy streets, which are now choked with cars. Nissan began selling cars in Myanmar in 2013, two years after a stream of political and economic reforms saw Western sanctions lifted, opening the impoverished country up to trade and foreign investment following nearly five decades of military rule.

Investors are hoping that Myanmar's economy keeps growing under a new government set to be formed by Aung San Suu Kyi's pro-democracy party next month. The carmaker's Myanmar expansion comes after the company reported weakening demand last week in Thailand and Indonesia-its two major Southeast Asian manufacturing hubs. But the company's profits still surged last year following strong North American sales and signs of a pick up in China. Japan's Suzuki already produces in Myanmar while US giant Ford Motor has opened a showroom in Yangon.—AFP

Gabon, men with shovels in hand dig from morning to night, filling wheelbarrows with soil laced with what they are looking for: gold. The clearing in the equatorial forest is covered with dozens of holes, some four meters deep. "We arrive around seven in the morning, and finish at $6:00\ pm...\ the\ production$ isn't that good," says Aboubakar Coulibably, a Malian with muscular arms who moves around 200 wheelbarrows full of the gold-bearing soil per

On good days, his team finds around nine or 10 grams of gold. The production may be small but now Gabon's government requires that these men panning for gold must sell what they find to the west African state-a situation the artisanal gold miners don't like especially in the face of growing competition from Chinese mining companies. William M'bouma employs five or six workers for around 10,000 CFA francs (15 euros) per day. 'We don't have a choice, it's hard but we make do," says the 31-year-old Gabonese, who came back to his native village after taking his chances-in vainin the capital Libreville.

'WORLD'S CHEAPEST SMARTPHONE' TO BE LAUNCHED IN INDIA

NEW DELHI: A little-known Indian company will launch a smartphone believed to be the cheapest in the world, targeting a market already dominated by lowcost handsets.

Set to be priced at under 500 rupees (\$7.30), domestic handset maker Ringing Bells' Freedom 251 smartphone is about one percent of the price of the latest Apple iPhone. Ringing Bells was set up in September 2015 and began selling mobile phones via its website a few weeks ago under its Bell brand, a spokeswoman said. "This is our flagship model and we think it will bring a revolution in the industry," she told AFP. Ringing Bells currently imports parts from overseas

and assembles them in India but plans to make its phones domestically within a year, the spokeswoman said.

Cheap smartphone handsets, many of them Chinese-made, are readily available in the Indian market but domestic competitors are making inroads, with models selling for less than \$20. India is the world's second-largest mobile market and notched up its billionth mobile phone subscriber in October, according to the country's telecoms regulator.

But in poorer Indian states such as Bihar, "teledensity"-the penetration of telephone connections for every hundred people-is as low as 54 percent, with a stark urban-rural divide. — AFP

COVERTLY, ISRAEL PREPARES TO FIGHT BOYCOTT ACTIVISTS ONLINE

TEL AVIV: Israel is using its world-leading expertise in cyber security to take on the growing threat of the global pro-Palestinian movement to boycott Israel. The Israeli government recently allotted nearly \$26 million in this year's budget to combat what it sees as worldwide efforts to "delegitimize" the Jewish state's right to exist. Some of the funds are earmarked for Israeli tech companies, many of them headed by former military intelligence officers, for digital initiatives aimed at gathering intelligence on activist groups and countering their efforts.

"I want to create a community of fighters," said Sima Vaknin-Gil, the director general of Israel's Ministry for Strategic Affairs and Public Diplomacy, to Israeli tech developers at a forum last month dedicated to the topic.

Initiatives are largely being kept covert. Participants at the invite-only forum, held on the sidelines of a cyber technology conference, repeatedly stood up to remind people that journalists were in the room. Among the government officials involved in the efforts are some of Israel's top secret-keepers, including Sima Shine, a former top official in the Mossad spy agency, and Vaknin-Gil, who recently retired as the chief military censor responsible for gag orders on state secrets.

Israel has established itself as a world leader in cyber technology innovation, fueled by graduates of prestigious and secretive military and security intelligence units. These units are widely thought to be behind some of the world's most advanced cyber-attacks, including the Stuxnet virus that attacked Iran's nuclear energy equipment last decade.

Each year, these units churn out a talent pool of Israelis who translate their skills to the corporate world. Now Israel is looking to harness their technological prowess for the fight to protect Israel's international image.

Vaknin-Gil said her ministry is encouraging initiatives to expose the funding and curb the activities of anti-Israel activists, as well as campaigns to "flood the Internet" with content that puts a positive face on Israel. She said some of these actions will not be publicly identified with the government, but that the ministry will not fund unethical or illegal digital initiatives.

GLOBAL NETWORK

Established about 10 years ago, the pro-Palestinian "BDS" campaign is a coalition of organizations that advocate boycotts, divestment and sanctions against Israel. Inspired by the anti-apartheid movement, BDS organizers say they are using nonviolent means to promote the Palestinian struggle for independence.

The movement has grown into a global network of thousands of volunteers, from campus activists to church groups to liberal Jews disillusioned by Israeli policies. They lobby corporations, artists and academic institutions to sever ties with Israel.

The movement has made inroads. US and British academic unions have endorsed boycotts, student governments at universities have made divestment proposals, and some famous musicians have refused to perform in Israel. The BDS movement also claims responsibility for pressuring some large companies to stop or modify operations in Israel. In its latest push, it has urged top Hollywood actors to reject a government-paid trip to Israel being offered to leading Oscar nominees.

Omar Barghouti, co-founder of the BDS movement, said "quite a few web pages" that BDS websites linked to have mysteri-

ously disappeared from the Internet. "We assume Israel's cyber sabotage is ongoing, but we are quite pleased that its detrimental impact on the global BDS movement has been dismal so far," he said.

Israel says the movement is rooted in anti-Semitism and seeks not to change Israeli policies, but ultimately to put an end to the Jewish state. Many online activists driving anti-Israeli campaigns on social media are tech-savvy, second- and thirdgeneration Muslims in Europe and the US who have grievances against the West and also lead online campaigns against European and US governments, said Elad Ratson, who tracks the issue for Israel's Foreign Ministry and spoke at last month's cybersecurity forum.

He said they often create code that allows activists to blast thousands of messages from social media accounts - creating the illusion that many protesters are sharing the same anti-Israel or anti-West message online.

Israeli officials lobby Facebook to remove pages it says incite violence against Israelis, and there has been talk of advancing legislation to restrict Facebook in Israel. A Facebook representative met with Strategic Affairs Minister Gilad Erdan in Israel last week about the matter.

PROMOTING TERRORIST ACTS

Ratson said social media giants are beginning to close inciting users' accounts. Twitter said in a statement this month that since mid-2015, it has closed more than 125,000 accounts that were "threatening or promoting terrorist acts, primarily related to ISIS," the Islamic State group. But he said Islamist activists are simply moving to "Darknet" sites not visible on the open

Some Israeli tech companies are starting to build sly algorithms to restrict these online activists' circle of influence on the "Darknet," so activists think their message is reaching others when in fact it is being contained, Ratson said.

Other Israeli companies work on forensic intelligence gathering, such as detecting digital or semantic signatures buried in activists' coding so they are able to track and restrict their online activity.

Firewall Israel, a non-profit initiative sponsored by the Reut Institute, an Israeli think tank, is building an online platform to help pro-Israel activists around the world communicate about anti-Israel activism in their communities. At a recent event the initiative held at Campus Tel Aviv, a Googlesponsored event space for entrepreneurs, an Israeli web expert taught young activists how to mine the internet for BDS activities.

"Delegitimizers are engaged in a Disneyland of hate," Igal Ram of Firewall Israel told seminar participants. "We want to act against the people who run the Disneyland ... and the useful idiots who help."

Inspiration, an Israeli intelligence analysis company founded by Ronen Cohen and Haim Pinto, former military intelligence officers, launched a technological initiative some months ago to collect intelligence on BDS organizations in Europe, particularly Scandinavian countries, the US, and South America, Cohen said. He said the initiative aims to dismantle the infrastructure of groups he said were responsible for incitement and anti-Semitism against Israel. He declined to give specifics.

"It's no different than an operation, which you sometimes read about in the newspaper, in Syria or Lebanon," Cohen said. "It's the kind of thing that, if you want to do it in the future ... you can't work in the open." — AP

DICE SUMMIT A CHANCE FOR GAME CREATORS TO RECHARGE, REFLECT

LAS VEGAS: For elite members of the video game industry, the D.I.C.E. Summit isn't merely a chance to schmooze at the poker table or on the golf course in Las Vegas. It's also an opportunity to address issues and innovations, ranging from gender diversity to virtual reality.

"It's really about people in the industry taking a break from what they're working on and reengaging in this medium they're so passionate about," said Martin Rae, president of the Academy of Interactive Arts and Sciences, which organizes the D.I.C.E. Summit.

While the 15th annual gathering officially started on Tuesday with poker, golf and "Magic: The Gathering" tournaments, the serious business begins Wednesday morning, when the Academy of Interactive Arts and Sciences Foundation will unveil a new initiative to promote gender diversity in the gaming industry.

According to the Electronic Software Association trade group, about 44 percent of gamers are woman, but only about 18 percent of game developers surveyed at last year's Game Developers Conference were female.

"We want to focus on helping women receive an education in games and get them integrated into the industry," said Rae. "Once they're engrained in the culture, game design will naturally move in new directions." Unlike other gaming industry gatherings, such as the Electronic Entertainment Expo, the D.I.C.E. Summit - which stands for design, innovate, communicate and entertain - is more business-minded and features a guest list that's intentionally kept small. For this year's summit, organizers expect about 700 attendees at the Mandalay Bay Convention Center.

"I'm really looking forward to what conversations we'll be having because last year, everyone was talking about mobile and user-acquisition spending," said Min Kim, co-founder of Nexon America and the interactive academy's chairman. "I'm done with that. I'm looking forward to people talking about games like 'Hearthstone' and how that became so successful. It's not just marketing."

MAGIC TRICK

The conference invited such gaming industry veterans as "Civilization" creator Sid Meier, "Fallout" creative director Todd Howard, Electronic Arts chief creative officer Richard Hilleman and "Rise of the Tomb Raider" writer Rhianna Pratchett to present talks.

Randy Pitchford, the president and CEO of "Borderlands" publisher Gearbox Software, will be joined by magician Penn Jillette for a session Wednesday on the intersection of illusion and

interactivity. The talk will conclude with the pair performing a magic trick that moves from the real world into virtual reality.

"Metal Gear Solid" creator Hideo Kojima and "Pacific Rim" filmmaker Guillermo del Toro will appear on stage together Thursday for the first time since their top-secret collaboration "Silent Hills" was canceled by publisher Konami.

"Kojima-san is being inducted into our hall of fame this year, and it was his idea to have del Toro on stage with him," said Rae. "We don't know where the conversation will go, but we thought it would be fascinating, and the audience would love it." For the first time, much of the summit's mingling will take place behind closed doors in afternoon roundtable sessions where attendees will have an opportunity to freely discuss issues affecting the gaming industry, such as online betting. The new format was adapted from the European version of the D.I.C.E. Summit.

"I think most of us are interested in looking ahead," said Ted Price, president and CEO of "Ratchet & Clank" developer Insomniac Games and the interactive academy's vice chairman. "I think that's why we want to participate in the roundtables. When you're face to face with experts from all corners of the industry, it's incredibly valuable to gain insight into what might be coming." — AP

APPLE REJECTS 'DANGEROUS' ORDER TO HACK US SHOOTER'S IPHONE

SAN FRANCISCO: Apple has rejected a judge's order to help the FBI break into an iPhone used by one of the San Bernardino shooters, warning it was "too dangerous" to create such a backdoor to the smartphones

US magistrate Judge Sheri Pym ordered Apple on Tuesday to provide "reasonable technical assistance" to the FBI, including disabling an auto-erase feature after too many unsuccessful attempts are made to unlock the iPhone 5C.

Federal prosecutors had filed a motion requesting Apple's help after the FBI failed to crack the phone's code two months into the investigation into the December rampage. Syed Farook, a US citizen, and his Pakistani wife Tashfeen Malik gunned down 14 people at an office party in San Bernardino, California, before they were killed in a shootout with police.

But Apple said it would fight the judge's order, firing the latest shot in a growing debate over encryption pitting the government against tech companies. "The United States government has demanded that Apple take an unprecedented step which threatens the security of our customers," Apple chief executive Tim Cook said in a statement on the company's website. "We oppose this order, which has implications far beyond the legal case at hand." Cook said it was too risky to provide the requested software because it could allow ill-intentioned individuals to unlock any iPhone and raises major privacy concerns. "The US government has asked us for something we simply do not have, and something we consider too dangerous to create. They have asked us to build a backdoor to the iPhone," Apple said.

"In the wrong hands, this software-which does not exist today-would have the potential to unlock any iPhone in someone's physical possession. "While the government may argue that its use would be limited to this case, there is no way to guarantee such control,"

he said, adding that Apple has cooperated with the FBI thus far. By disabling the security features, the FBI would be able to attempt as many different password combinations as needed before gaining access to the phone. It was the property of the San Bernardino County Department of Public Health, which employed Farook, and the authority had agreed to the search of the phone.

'CHILLING'

Pym ordered Apple to provide software that would only run on the device in question, or any other technological means to access its data.

But Apple said it was impossible to create such a tool that could only be used once, on one phone. "Once created, the technique could be used over and over again, on any number of devices," Apple said. "In the physical world, it would be the equivalent of a master key, capable of opening hundreds of millions of locks-from restaurants and banks to stores and homes. No reasonable person would find that accept-

The US government is concerned that commercially-available encryption benefits criminals.

Tech companies, intent on securing the trust of consumers after government spying revelations made by Edward Snowden, have been reluctant to be seen as helping authorities spy on users.

"We can find no precedent for an American com-

pany being forced to expose its customers to a greater risk of attack," Apple said.

"The implications of the government's demands are chilling." "If the government can use the All Writs Act to make it easier to unlock your iPhone, it would have the power to reach into anyone's device to capture their data."

Cook warned that if Apple complied with the order, the government could demand surveillance software to intercept, access health and financial data, track users' location or access a phone's microphone or camera without the user's knowledge. "We are challenging the FBI's demands with the deepest respect for American democracy and a love of our country," Cook added. US Attorney Eileen Decker had earlier called the order "another step-a potentially important step-in the process of learning everything we possibly can about the attack in San Bernardino."

FBI Director James Comey revealed last week that investigators had not been able to crack open the phone two months into the investigation. "It affects our counterterrorism work." he said. — AFP

PATIENT WEARS 3-D GLASSES DURING BRAIN SURGERY

PARIS: In a world first, a patient in France undergoing brain surgery while conscious wore virtual reality glasses as doctors removed a cancerous tumour, the chief surgeon told AFP Tuesday. "In creating a completely artificial world for the patient, we could map certain zones and connections of his brain related to functions that we could not, up to now, easily test on the operating table," Philippe Menei, a neurosurgeon at Angers hospital in western France, told AFP. The operation was performed on January 27, and the patient was recovering well, he said.


Taking a scalpel to the brain while a patient is conscious has been a common practice for more than a decade. Doing so allows doctors to determine, during an operation, whether and how vital functions such as speech, vision and movement are affected. Patients cannot feel the probing of their brain tissue, and do not experience pain.

But using three-dimensional, virtual reality opens up a whole new range of possibilities, Menei said. "By totally controlling what the patient sees and hears, we can put him in situations that allow us to do tests on certain (neural) connections that were not possible before," he said.

In this case, it was crucial to protect the patient's vision because he had already lost sight in one eye

due to an illness. During the operation, the medical team created a neutral virtual environment with no single point of focus. "In this empty void, we could

appear in the patient's peripheral vision," Menei said. Three weeks after the operation, the patient's vision was intact despite the removal of an aggressive tumour in a region controlling sight. — AFP

BIG-BRAINED MAMMALS MORE LIKELY TO FACE EXTINCTION

PARIS: Mammals with large brains tend to tend to live longer, say scientists. A profesbe smarter but they also face a greater chance today of going extinct, according to a study published yesterday. Scientists have long known that having oodles of grey matter comes at a certain cost. Supplying a big brain with blood, for example, requires a lot of energy. But even if there isn't a direct correlation between size and intelligence humans don't have the biggest brains in the animal kingdom, even in proportion to their body size-a bigger

bundle of neurons is usually seen as a plus. Mammals with a capacious cranium also sor at Stanford University, Eric Abelson, suspected there might be a link between larger brains and the risk of extinction. To test his hypothesis, he examined museum samples from more than 1,650 animals from 160 different species in the Americas.

Abelson measured the skulls and body sizes of creatures as small as rodents and as big as buffalos, but did not include aquatic animals. The next step was to check their status on the global endangered species list maintained by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

The so-called Red List classification is broken down into half-a-dozen levels of extinction threat. Abelson also examined a second data set of more than 600 species of animals across the globe. To his surprise, he found a clear pattern: animals with larger brains were more at risk of going the way of the dodo and the dino.

Body size

In the Americas, the link was especially strong for mammals with a big brain relative to body size. "This likely represents a case of 'endangerment filtering'," he explained in the study. "Species in North America have gone through a period where large-bodied species had suffered large population losses."

These animals are now either extinct or protected with rebounding populations, and thus not-in either case-considered endangered, he added.

The findings come at a time when scientists believe Earth is entering a "mass extinction event," only the sixth in the last half-billion years.

The most recent occurred 65 million years ago, and wiped out non-avian

dinosaurs. The current die-off is a result of changes set in motion by human activity and climate change, with life in the oceans particularly affected.

According to the IUCN, coral reefshome to over a quarter of all marine species-could disappear by 2050. About 41 percent of amphibians and 26 of mammal species are currently facing the prosect of disappearing entirely. Abelson said further research into the correlation between brain and body size could give scientists new tools to predict extinction rates. — AFP

DOCTORS: UPSURGE IN PARALYSIS CONDITION ACCOMPANIES ZIKA

CUCUTA, Colombia: The doctor taps Zulay Balza's knees with a hammer and she doesn't feel a thing. She can't squeeze his outstretched fingers or shut her eyelids. Her face is partially paralyzed. "The weakness started in my legs and climbed upward. The face was last. After three days, I couldn't walk," said Balza, 49. "My legs felt

Balza is a patient at the public University Hospital in Cucuta, at the epicenter of the Colombian outbreak of the mosquito-borne Zika virus. Only Brazil has more cases. Two weeks ago, she came under assault by Guillain-Barre (gee-YOHN-bah-RAY), a rare and sometimes fatal affliction that is the Western world's most common cause of general paralysis. Alarm over the Zika epidemic spreading across the Americas has been chiefly over birth defects, but frontline physicians believe a surge in Guillain-Barre cases may also be related.

The World Health Organization says Guillain-Barre cases are on the rise in Brazil, Colombia, El Salvador, Suriname and Venezuela, all hit hard by Zika, though a link remains unproven. The auto-immune disorder historically strikes only one or two people in 100,000. About one in 20 of those cases ends in death in the developed world, and it is frightful.

"I thought my body was going to explode," said Balza, sitting on her hospital bed and apparently over the worst. Guillain-Barre attacks skeletal muscular nerves as if they were a foreign enemy. Fine motor skills rapidly erode, arms and legs tingle and weaken to numbness. Patients lose their balance, their speech. In rare cases, they require ventilators to stay alive.

'Epidemiological association'

The syndrome typically strikes after a bacterial or viral infection, such as influenza, HIV or dengue, though its cause can't always be determined. Dr Jairo Lizarazo, the neurologist treating Balza, has seen cases increase more than tenfold since December - 30 cases in all - in this muggy city bordering Venezuela. Like Balza, many patients never showed the characteristic symptoms of Zika - fever, rashes, joint pain and conjunctivitis. Four in five don't.

He's convinced the virus boosts susceptibility to Guillain-Barre. "It's an epidemiological association," said Lizarazo. "We don't know exactly how it works. But it's there, for sure. Associated cases confirmed or suspected based on clinical evidence number in the hundreds. Guillain-Barre cases believed to be linked to the virus have killed three people in recent weeks in Colombia and health officials have attributed another three Guillian-Barre deaths in Venezuela to suspected Zika infections.

WHO said Zika has been confirmed present in apparently just one Guillain-Barre death, in the northwestern Venezuela state of Zulia in January. Dr Maria Lucia Brito Ferreira, chief neurologist at Hospital da Restauração in Recife, Brazil, said she hopes to get laboratory confirmation this month that nine Guillain-Barre deaths recorded there in the past year were Zika-related. Cases of Guillain-Barre in Colombia - about 450 annually before Zika struck - were

up nearly threefold in the past month and a half. El Salvador has reported 118 cases since November, nearly as many as previously seen in a year. "The only explanation is the Zika virus," said Deputy Health Minister Eduardo Espinoza.

Dr Osvaldo Nascimento, a leading Rio neurologist, estimates Brazilian cases of Guillain-Barre are up fivefold. Reporting is not compulsory, so the government's partial figure of 1,868 cases requiring hospitalization last year is a sketchy

An upsurge in Guillain-Barre was documented in 2013 during a major Zika outbreak in French Polynesia, with a study finding cases up twentyfold. WHO said all 42 cases recorded in the Pacific archipelago tested positive for Zika as well as dengue fever, which is also currently present in Colombia, Venezuela, Brazil and other Zika-affected countries.

Antibodies for the dengue and chikungunya viruses, which are far more debilitating than Zika, are often being found in infected patients. That is making establishing a direct Zika-Guillain-Barre link more complicated. Like Zika, both viruses are transmitted by the Aedes aegypti mosquito and could also trigger Guillian-Barre, experts say.

Under normal circumstances, eight in 10 patients nearly fully recover from Guillian-Barre, though it sometimes takes months. Data on Guillain-Barre is scant in most of the developing world. Of 18 countries participating in a clinical study launched by Dutch physicians in 2012, only two are in Latin America: Mexico and Argentina. Brazil just joined.

Lack of funding

Across the region, investigators were simply unable to get government funding to participate, said Dr Ken Gorson, a Tufts University neurologist and president-elect of an international foundation that combats Guillain-Barre. Poorer countries were ill-prepared to manage the crisis. Colombia's National Health Institute is overwhelmed with a weeks-long backlog in completing tests for Zika.

The three Guillain-Barre deaths that the country's Health Ministry attributed to Zika on Feb. 5 have not yet been confirmed by laboratory tests, said spokesman Ricardo Amortegui. Nor have the three deaths in the Venezuelan state of Lara announced last week.

One Guillian-Barre fatality in Colombia suspected of being linked to Zika was a 51-year-old man from the Caribbean island of San Andres who died in November, said Rita Almanza, epidemiology chief in Medellin. The others were a 45-year-old man and a 41-year-old woman flown from Turbo on the Caribbean coast who died in Medellin in February.

Guillain-Barre grabbed hold of Nancy Pino in neighboring Venezuela with devastating effect. The 68-year retired school administrator developed fever, rashes and muscle pain while celebrating Christmas with her family in the hot lowland state of Anzoategui. She recovered quickly. Days later, her hands and feet started to go numb. Her tongue felt like it was asleep. She stopped eating. —AP

UN: STOPPING ZIKA MAY REQUIRE GENETICALLY MODIFIED INSECTS

Controversial methods may be a necessary

GENEVA: The World Health Organization says it may be necessary to use controversial methods like genetically modified mosquitoes to wipe out the insects that are spreading the Zika virus across the Americas.

The virus has been linked to a spike in babies born with abnormally small heads, or microcephaly, in Brazil and French Polynesia. The UN health agency has declared Zika a global emergency, even though there is no definitive proof it is causing the birth defects. WHO said its advisory group has recommended further field trials of genetically modified mosquitoes, which have previously been tested in small trials in countries

including the Cayman Islands and Malaysia. "Given the magnitude of the Zika crisis, WHO encourages affected countries ... to boost the use of both old and new approaches to mosquito control as the most immediate line of defense," WHO said in a statement. WHO says at least 34 countries have been hit by the virus in

the current crisis, mostly in Latin America. Meanwhile, the European Union on Tuesday pledged 10 million Euros (\$11.2 million) to fund research on the mosquito and the Zika virus in Brazil - the epicenter of the outbreak. The pledge came as Brazilian Health Minister Marcelo Castro met with representatives of 24 European nations in the Brazilian capital, Brasilia. Next week, WHO chief Dr. Margaret Chan will also travel to Brazil to discuss Zika and microcephaly with Castro and other officials, agency spokeswoman Fadela Chaib said on Tuesday.

'Ability to adapt'

WHO said previous experiments that released sterile insects have been used by other UN agencies to control agricultural pests. The agency described the Aedes aegypti mosquitoes that spread Zika - as well as other diseases including dengue and yellow fever - as an "aggressive" mosquito that uses "sneak attacks" to bite people, noting that the mosquito has shown "a remarkable ability to adapt."

Last month, British biotech firm Oxitec said tests in Brazil in 2015 showed that genetically altered sterile male mosquitoes succeeded in reducing a type of disease-spreading mosquito larvae by 82 percent in one neighborhood in the city of Piracicaba. The genetically modified males don't spread disease because only female mosquitoes bite. Environmentalists have previously criticized the genetically modified approach, saying wiping out an entire population of insects could have

unforeseen knock-on effects on the ecosystem. Some experts agreed it might be worth using genetically tweaked mosquitoes given the speed of Zika but were unsure of the eventual consequences. "The way this is done wouldn't leave lots of mutant mosquitoes in the countryside," said Jimmy Whitworth, an infectious diseases expert at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. He said the Zika mosquitoes are an imported species that were accidentally brought to the Americas hundreds of years ago, and was optimistic their eradication wouldn't damage the environment.

However, he said such a move would be unprecedented and it would be impossible to know what the impact might be before releasing the insects into the wild. "You would hope that the ecology would just return to how it was before this mosquito arrived," he said. "But there's no way of knowing that for sure."

Last week, a group of doctors in Argentina Physicians in the Crop-Sprayed Towns, suggested the jump in microcephaly cases may not be caused by Zika, but by Pyriproxyfen, a larvicide used in drinking water that aims to prevent mosquito larvae from developing into adulthood. The group said the larvicide has been used since 2014 in Brazil in several areas with a reported rise in babies with birth defects. Spokeswoman Chaib said scientists at WHO and elsewhere had rejected any such link.

"They have reviewed all the scientific literature linked to this pesticide in particular and found the same conclusion: That there is no scientific evidence that can link this pesticide in particular to the cases of microcephaly," she said. Brazil's government has repeatedly said pesticides were not connected to microcephaly, and has noted many cases of microcephaly in areas where Pyriproxyfen was not used. The government also noted that WHO had approved use of the chemical. — AP

TRANSGENDER BATHROOM BILL SENT TO DAKOTA GOVERNOR

PIERRE: South Dakota would be the first state in the US to approve a law requiring transgender students to use bathrooms and locker rooms that correspond to their sex at birth if the governor signs a bill passed Tuesday by the state Senate.

The Senate voted 20-15 to send the bill to Republican Gov. Dennis Daugaard, who initially responded positively to the measure but said last week he'd need to study it more before making a decision. Advocates say the bill is meant to protect the privacy of students, but opponents say it discriminates against vulnerable adolescents.

Under the plan, schools would have to provide a "reasonable accommodation" for transgender students, such as a singleoccupancy bathroom or the "controlled use" of a staff-designated restroom, locker room or shower room. Republican Sen David Omdahl urged other legislators Tuesday to support the bill to "preserve the innocence of our young people."

The American Civil Liberties Union of South Dakota and Human Rights Campaign have been vocal in their opposition to the measure and have called on Daugaard to veto the legislation. "History has never looked kindly upon those who attack the basic civil rights of their fellow Americans, and history will not treat kindly those who support this discriminatory measure," Chad Griffin, the president of the LGBT-rights organization Human Rights Campaign, said in a statement Tuesday. Transgender advocates have also criticized comments made by some lawmakers, including Omdahl, about transgender people.

"I'm sorry if you're so twisted you don't know who you are," Omdahl said at a recent event when asked about the bill. "I'm telling you right now, it's about protecting the kids, and I don't even understand where our society is these days." Several states have looked at addressing gender and public facilities in the past several years. But South Dakota would be the first state in the nation to put such a measure into law, said Joellen Kralik, a research analyst at the National Conference of State Legislatures. —AP

MENOPAUSE REMAINS AN **EVOLUTIONARY PUZZLE**

PARIS: Menopause in women and females from a few other "higher" species is probably a fluke of nature rather than evolution at work, according to a study published yesterday. Biologists have long puzzled over why women lose the capacity to reproduce during roughly the last third of their lives.

Another, less polite, way scientists frame the question is this: why do females from a handful of speciesincluding killer whales-continue to live well beyond the age when they can bear offspring? "Menopause is an evolutionary paradox," said Hazel Nichols, a biologist at Liverpool John Moores University and lead author of the study.

"An early end to reproduction seems contrary to the laws of natural selection, where passing on genes to the next generation is the main purpose of life." In most mammals, she pointed out, females reproduce until a ripe old age. Evolutionary biologists have put forward competing explanations for this extended "post-reproductive lifespan," or PRLS.

The "grandmother hypothesis" suggests women outlive their fertility in order to help raise grandchildren, thereby strengthening the likelihood that their own genes will survive. In this scenario, "grandmothers... encouraging their sons to have more children" are driven by a biological imperative, Nichols told AFP. Even among orcas, scientists have shown that females remain with their male offspring, and probably teach them hunting techniques and where to apply them.

Evolutionary tinkering

Another theory says that menopause does not, in fact, confer any advantage in the Darwinian struggle to pass on genes from one generation to the next, but is just an accident resulting in a "mismatch" in the ageing process. "Different parts of the body are likely to age at different rates, in the same way that some part of a car wear out before others," Nichols said.

In this argument, modern medicine and nutrition has helped outpace the evolutionary process, extending human life beyond its "natural" limits. To find out who might be right, Nichols and colleagues examined data from 26 different mammal species, including three tribal or historial human populations.

In each case, they tested for the effects of lifespan, group size, and the tendency of post-menopause females to stay within either a male- or femaledominated group. What they found is that neither school of thought could adequately explain the menopause puzzle, but that when combined, a

coherent picture began to emerge. "Post-reproductive lifespan appears to arise by chance," Nichols said by email. "But then evolutionary 'tinkering' comes into play to extend PRLS in species that benefit from females caring for their sons and grandchildren." Among orcas the bond is so strong that "many killer whale sons die in the year after their mother's death," she said. The findings were published in Biology Letters, a journal of Britain's Royal Society. — AFP

URBANIZATION LEADS TO CHANGE IN TYPE OF BACTERIA AT HOME

WASHINGTON: Whether it's a jungle hut or a high-rise apartment, your home is covered in bacteria, and new research from the Amazon suggests city dwellers might want to open a window. Scientists traveled from remote villages in Peru to a large Brazilian city to begin tracking the effects of urbanization on the diversity of bacteria in people's homes. It's a small first step in a larger quest understanding how different environmental bugs help shape what's called our microbiome, the trillions of bacteria that share our bodies and play a critical role in our health.

"Very little is known about the microbes of the built environment," microbiologist Maria Gloria Dominguez-Bello of New York University, who led the pilot study, said at a meeting of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. Her team found that as people living in the Amazon rainforest become more urbanized, the kinds of bacteria in their homes change from the bugs mostly found in nature to those that typically live on people, she reported Friday.

In fact, in city dwellings, the researchers could tell just by the microbial fingerprints of the walls that "this is a kitchen or this is a bathroom or this is a living room. That's amazing," Dominguez-Bello said. As she puts it, "the walls talk." Everyone carries a customized set of microbes on the skin, in the nose and in the gut, a microbial zoo that starts forming at birth and help with such things as digestion and immune development. What influences the balance of good bugs and bad varies depending on such things as your diet, if you were born vaginally or by C-section, and antibiotics.

Environmental exposures play a role, too. The hygiene hypothesis, for example, suggests asthma and allergies are on the rise in Western populations because of a lack of early contact with once-common bugs, one reason why tots who grow up on farms or around animals tend to have fewer of those immune-

Increasingly, scientists also are investigating where we spend a lot of time - indoor spaces, especially our homes. To track the effects of urbanization, Dominguez-Bello's team analyzed the microbial communities of 10 houses and their inhabitants from each of three Peruvian locations - a village of hunter-gatherers, a slightly more modern rural village and Iquitos, a medium-sized city not accessible by roads - and the contemporary Brazilian city of Manaus. — AP

THREE GRAVITATIONAL WAVE PROJECTS UNVEILED IN CHINA

BEIJING: Chinese scientists have unveiled three separate projects to investigate gravitational waves, state media said yesterday, days after earthshaking US discoveries that confirmed Einstein's century-old predictions.

Space officials said such research would give China-which has an ambitious, military-run, multi-billion-dollar space program that Beijing sees as symbolizing the country's progress-an opportunity to become a "world leader" in the field.

Gravitational waves are direct evidence of ripples in the fabric of space-time, and their first-ever observation was announced by US scientists last week. The Chinese Academy of Sciences (CAS) rolled out a proposal for a space-based gravitational wave detection project, the official Xinhua news agency reported. The proposed Taiji program, named after the "supreme ultimate" of Chinese philosophy symbolized by the yin-yang sign, would send satellites of its own into orbit or share equipment with the European Space Agency's eLISA initiative. Separately, Sun Yatsen University in Guangzhou also proposed to launch satellites into space, while the Institute

of High Energy Physics at CAS suggested a land-based scheme in Tibet.

All three projects have yet to obtain government approval, state media said. But Chinese physicist Hu Wenrui told the People's Daily newspaper, the official mouthpiece of the Communist party: "If we launch our own satellites, we will have a chance to be a world leader" in gravitational wave research. Success "depends on the decision-makers' resolution and the country's investment", he added.

On a verified social media account the Chinese Academy of Science said: "If we can participate in these sorts of extremely precise technological projects then in a short time it will give a huge boost to our country's manufacturing industries."

Last week, scientists with the US-based Large Interferometer Gravitational-Wave Observatory (LIGO) said they had detected waves resulting from the collision of two black holes 1.3 billion years ago. The executive director of the laboratory hailed the discovery as being comparable to Galileo's use of the telescope four centuries ago to open the era of modern astronomy. — AFP

NEW TURTLE SPECIES FOUND IN PAPUA NEW GUINEA

SYDNEY: A new species of freshwater turtle has been discovered in Papua New Guinea, one of a group which would have been present for the full geological formation of its main Pacific island, researchers said.

Mountainous and tropical Papua New Guinea is known for its rich biological diversity, but much of its remote areas are relatively unexplored. The new turtle is one of three distantly-related species-Elseya novaeguineae, Elseya schultzei and the new Elseya rhodini-found across New Guinea Island, according to a recent study published in international journal Zootaxa. The eastern part of New Guinea island is PNG while the western side is Indonesia. "The three species evolved from a common ancestor between 17 and 19 million years ago," lead author Arthur Georges from the University of

Canberra said Tuesday.

"These ages are quite remarkable and came as a surprise, because it means these turtles have together seen the full geological development of the island of New Guinea. "The other species of freshwater turtle appear to have arrived after New Guinea had formed much as we see it today," he added. The newly-discovered turtle species is part of the Chelidae family of side-neck turtles which are restricted to South America and Australia, along with PNG, Timor and Rote in Indonesia. It was identified as a new species distinct from its distant relatives from genetic and other data and found to be distributed across much of the island, south of the central ranges. Georges said it was "a very pretty turtle" and that one of its distinguishing features was its reddish

JAPAN LAUNCHES SATELLITE TO STUDY BLACK HOLES

TOKYO: Japan successfully launched a jointly developed space observation satellite yesterday tasked with studying mysterious black holes, the country's space agency said. The ASTRO-H satellite, developed in collaboration between the agency, NASA and other groups, is set to orbit at an altitude of about 580 kilometers and observe X-rays emanating mainly from black holes and galaxy clusters. The satellite was carried out by the country's mainstay H-IIA rocket, which soared towards the heavens from the Tanegashima Space Center in southern Japan

under mostly clear late afternoon skies. The broadcast was nationally televised and the Japan Aerospace Exploration Agency said the satellite separated from the rocket with no difficulty.

Black holes have never been directly observed, but the announcement on the first detection of gravitational waves earlier this month indirectly added to the evidence that black holes do actually exist. The Japanese rocket, which was initially scheduled for liftoff last Friday but was postponed due to bad weather, was launched at 5:45 pm (0845 GMT). — AFP

Modern 'Indiana Jones' on mission to save antiquities

technology-wielding archeologist billed as a real-world "Indiana Jones" called Tuesday for an online platform that entices just about anyone to help find undiscovered treasures and defend archeological wonders. Sarah Parcak envisions a 21st century army of citizen scientists to battle the looting and destruction of the world's antiquities. And now, thanks to winning this year's coveted TED Prize, her wish may just come true. "We are at a tipping point with our cultural heritage," Parcak told reporters. "We are losing the battle against looters. If we don't do something in the next couple of years, it will be gone."

The TED Prize provides a million dollars to kickstart a big vision and opens a door to call on the nonprofit organization's innovative, influential and ingenious community of "tedsters" for help. Parcak wants people around the world to become explorers, detecting antiquities looting faster than currently possible and pointing archeologists to promising spots on the planet. "The only way we are going to be able to get ahead of the looters and protect sites is to engage the world and make them part of what we do as archeologists," Parcak said.

Her exploration includes a game with digital "cards" that people can quickly flip through to scrutinize satellite imagery for tombs, pyramids, looting "pits" and other points of potential interest to archeologists. Only tiny sections of imagery will be shown, along with broad location data such as what country is involved. "The last thing we want is for looters to log-in and help find sites to loot," Parcak said. "The most exciting part is, it will be a game." Parcak condemned destruction of antiquities by the likes of violent extremists from the Islamic State group and saw looting done by the desperately poor as "heartbreaking."

Digital digs

Archeologists will follow up on sites pinpointed by the "crowd," paving the way for protection from governments or law enforcement agencies. Virtual explorers will visit digs using social media tools such as Periscope, Instagram and Google+. "The world is going to get to engage with archeology in a way that has not been done before at this scale," Parcak said. Her team is consulting with citizen scientists and game experts on the project. "We don't know what getting people excited about discovery will do," Parcak said.

"We know this will allow the world to become archeological activists as well as discoverers." Enlisting people in countries around the world is vital in the fight against intentional destruction of antiquities and looting that is "spiraling out of control," she maintained. "We can't stop the looting, and we can't change the mindset of people like ISIL, but we can become advocates to stem the antiquities trade," Parcak said. She hopes to roll the platform out this year. "Sarah is the ultimate 21st century explorer," said TED Prize direc-

tor Anna Verghese. "We find ourselves at a critical moment in time when we can empower and ignite an army of citizen scientists to find, share and protect our heritage."

Spying the past from space Parcak was introduced to aerial photography through her grandfather's use of it in forestry

work. She was studying Egyptology at Yale when she began exploring the potential for using more modern tools to apply her grandfather's approach to archeology. Parcak was pursuing an advanced degree at Cambridge University when she created a technique for processing infrared imagery from satellites that helped her detect undiscovered archeological sites in Egypt.

She has since turned to mapping looting. Her work has caused some to refer to Parcak as a realworld version of the Indiana Jones character made famous in films starring Harrison Ford. Parcak is a professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, where she founded the Laboratory for Global Observation. She has won attention for her work satellite mapping Egypt and uncovering hidden pyramids, tombs and settlements.

The annual TED Prize has grown from \$100,000 to a million dollars since it was first awarded in the year 2005, to U2 band leader Bono and his vision of fighting poverty and disease. The TED community includes scientists, celebrities, politicians, artists, and entrepreneurs. Since its inception in 1984, the gathering has grown into a global forum for "ideas worth spreading." TED has won a worldwide following for trademark "talks" during which accomplished speakers deliver thought-sparking presentations. Videos of talks are available for free online at

he Associated Press is all over New York Fashion Week, from the runway designs to the celebrity-filled front rows. Here are some recent highlights:

A little leather, at Oscar De La Renta

Longtime devotees of Oscar de la Renta were in for a little surprise at the label's runway show Tuesday evening: a leather dress, in a cool shade of raspberry. What? Leather dresses at de la Renta? Peter Copping, only about a year into his job as

the late fashion icon's hand-picked successor, was trying something different. "It was something new to put into an Oscar de la Renta show," Copping said in a backstage interview. "I think the silhouettes felt very Oscar in some ways, fitted through the waist and then going into a bell skirt. But the material took it somewhere else."

Change is important - but in small steps, the designer said. "I'm very respectful of the legacy of the house but you have to challenge it as well, it can't just stand still," Copping said. "You need to move forward. But it's very important to do it gradually, step by step." Copping was also going for a juxtaposition of old and new. And when we say old, we mean 18th-century old. He went searching through a historical archive of fabrics in upstate New York. "I was really looking at old 18th-century fabrics like tapestries," he said. "Then we brought them back and scanned them into the computer, played with the scale, changed the colors ... and then found some interesting fabric bases, to add some modern touches."

Speaking of modern, Copping said he was also influenced by the contemporary artist Jeff Koons, who displayed his famous balloon animals at the Chateau de Versailles in 2008. That's the sort of contrast Copping was looking for with a shiny silver sequined bodice paired with a traditional timeless skirt, for example. And that leather dress? It was paired with a brocade "Antoinette" pump. How's that for mixing old and

Coach goes for a makeover

Coach is scrapping its Middle American image. The leather goods brand, which celebrates its 75th anniversary this year, grabbed the fashion crowd's attention Tuesday with its luxury collection called Coach 1941. It marked the second runway show for the high-end line, which made its debut in stores this month. This time, its executive creative director Stuart Vevers reimagined Americana looks, for example mixing team sport uniforms with feminine touches like ruffles. There were oversized varsity jackets paired with floral dresses or ruffled blouses. The collection also highlighted lots of shearling coats or vests shown with leather or floral skirts. There were all types of handbags from shoulder strap versions to satchels.

"What really appealed to me was the idea of this juxtaposition between something quite tough and then a softness," said Vevers, interviewed backstage. "There is a certain nostalgia about a varsity jacket and these very nostalgic dresses with the frills, very feminine." Vevers acknowledged it's not

easy to reinvent a label. "Changing someone's perception of a brand is a feat," he said, but he added: "People have a fun nostalgic place for Coach. " Among the front-row guests was Riley Keough, actress and granddaughter of Elvis Presley. "I love what he's doing with Coach. It's very much my vibe," said Keough, wearing a floral- printed dress from Coach 1941's spring collection. 'It's a lot cooler now, and younger."7

Rodarte channels 'The Godfather'

When Kate and Laura Mulleavy of Rodarte dream up an idea for a collection, they don't, as some designers do, make picture boards and map out exactly how they're going to reference the idea in each garment. "It's not specific references, really just a feeling," says Kate Mulleavy. "We tend to be fairly abstract." For their new collection, which they showed Tuesday in a Chelsea gallery space, the designing sisters said they were inspired while visiting San Francisco to do a season based loosely on "The Godfather" movies.





Cole's family outraged over 'Disrespectful' Grammys tribute

atalie Cole's family is not happy with the 58th Grammy Awards' tribute to the late singer-songwriter. The awards show paid homage to Cole, who died of congestive heart failure on Dec 31, 2015, with a video clip of the R&B singer performing a virtual duet of "Unforgettable" with her father, renowned jazz pianist Nat King Cole. As David Bowie, BB King, Lemmy Kilmister and Glenn Frey, who all died in 2015, were celebrated with honorary musical performances during the awards ceremony, Cole's family members considered the brief video

"Words cannot express the outrage and utter disappointment at the disrespectful tribute, or lack thereof, to a legendary artist such as our sister," Cole's sisters, Timolin and Casey, told ET. Added Cole's son Robert Adam Yancy: "Here is a woman who has been in the business for four decades, had 21 Grammy nominations and won nine Grammys. She deserves more than (to be a part of) a minute-and-a-half tribute. It was shameless the way they minimized her legacy. We will find solace in her legacy as well as her endless fans around the world."

Cole was known for hits including "This Will Be," "I Live

for Your Love" and "Unforgettable." She also dabbled in acting in her later years, landing guest appearances on TV series including "Touched by an Angel," "I'll Fly Away," "Grey's Anatomy" and "Law & Order: SVU." Fans as well as other artists and entertainment figures including Toni Braxton, Holly Robinson Peete and Lee Daniels also took note of Cole's brief Grammys tribute, resorting to social media to voice their disappointment. — Reuters

Anne Frank filmmakers hope movie warms mood on refugees

ermany's first feature-length biopic of Anne Frank premiered this week in Berlin, with the film about persecution against the teenage Jewish diarist carrying added meaning as Europe grapples with its biggest post-war refugee crisis. "Persecution, expulsion, displacement and destruction are issues that we just can't shake off," said Fred Breinersdorfer, who wrote the script for "Das Tagebuch der Anne Frank" (The Diary of Anne Frank). "If our film about the fate of a persecuted and destroyed Jewish family can contribute to a more positive attitude towards refugees, then we can all be proud," he said about the family, most of whose members died in Nazi concentration camps.

Attitudes are split in Europe over a record refugee influx, with mostly eastern EU nations wanting asylum seekers kept out while others are adopting a more welcoming attitude, including Germany which took in over one million asylum seekers last year. The film tells the story of the diarist, played by 16-year-old Lea van Acken, and her family, as they are forced to leave Germany to seek refuge in the Netherlands after Hitler's rise in power. But the Nazis swept into the Netherlands in 1940, and the Franks were finally forced to go into hiding in 1942, when Anne's sister Margot received official notice to report to a work

In her diary, Anne chronicled her life in hiding until August 1944, when her family was betrayed. Speaking after the premiere during the youth showcase of the Berlin film festival, co-producer Walid Nakschbandi said he hoped the movie would spark a discussion in the current context of Europe's refugee influx. "If you start today to talk about her fate, about sincerity and ... to speak about the sentence 'He who saves one life, saves the whole world, then, as makers of the film, we would have achieved a lot," he told the mostly teenage audience.

'Normal life stolen'

Anne's diary was first published in Dutch in 1947 by her father Otto, the only one in her family who survived. More than 30 million copies have been sold, and numerous adaptations of the book have been made, including in theatre, television series and film. But

the Anne Frank Fonds, which hold the rights to the written work, said it was time for another major film production. "We thought it would be really important to have a movie in a contemporary language, and in the German language as well because the family lived 400 years in Germany," said Yves Kugelmann, member of the foundation's board, adding that it gave the crew access to archives containing 100,000 documents, objects and photographs.

Using the material, the film team was able to piece together a picture of the Frank's family life, and director Hans Steinbichler said each scene in the film "had a source". What was crucial to him was to portray Anne Frank as the girl next door, "For me it was important to remove Anne Frank from this so-called throne, this sacrosanct status... because that was the only way to carry the message that what was stolen from her was a very normal life," said Steinbichler. In the adaptation, Anne Frank, cooped up in a secret annex, is in the throes of adolescence. She has fights with her mother and falls in love with Peter van Daan, whose family had joined the Franks as

Van Acken told Bild daily she sought to reread Anne Frank's diary closely in a bid to get into the role, and even "started to write letters to Anne, in which I told her some things about me". The young actress was sporting short hair at the premiere after her long locks were shorn in one of the closing scenes of the film depicting Anne's arrival at the Auschwitz death camp. The diarist died of typhus in Bergen-Belsen in 1945. The biopic was not without controversy, after it emerged that the Anne Frank Fonds had written to Steinbichler to complain about his concurrent plan to make a film about Nazi propaganda filmmaker Leni Riefenstahl. "We iust don't think Leni Riefenstahl and Anne Frank should be mentioned on the same page," Kugelmann told AFP, adding however that Steinbichler had said he would drop the Riefenstahl project. — AFP

Winslet says playing a Brit 'would be ultimate challenge'

aving put on an array of foreign accents in her awardwinning career, British actress Kate Winslet says she really wants to play an English character, adding it would be "the ultimate challenge". The "Titanic" star has pretended to be American, Australian, Polish-Armenian and in her latest film, crime thriller "Triple 9", a Russian-Israeli mafia boss. "My M.O. (modus operandi) is just keep doing the unexpected. Although I do also keep trying to play an English person but that just doesn't keep happening for me at the moment," Winslet told Reuters in an interview.

'That would be the ultimate challenge and then I'd have no dialect coach at all. No one to have my back and I would be all by myself and probably more terrified than ever before. Wouldn't that be novel?" Winslet plays the bejewelled and designer-clad Irina Vlaslov in action-packed "Triple 9" about corrupt police and the criminal underworld-a role she said "felt very out of my comfort zone". "I don't know anyone like this woman. I didn't like her. I didn't empathize with her. I wanted that challenge of playing a character who really felt like a character," she said.

Winslet is in the running for an Academy Award for her portrayal in "Steve Jobs" of the late Apple co-founder's colleague Joanna Hoffman. She won an Oscar for "The Reader", an Emmy Award for "Mildred Pierce", a Best Spoken Word Album For Children Grammy for "Listen to the Storyteller", meaning she is just missing a Tony Award to complete the "EGOT" acronym of all four major entertainment honors.

Asked if going to Broadway was next, Winslet said: "Well I suppose it probably is now. And that's more because of my 12-year-old son Joe, who ... is just obsessed with records." "So since he has learnt about this 'EGOT' thing, he's like, 'Mum you've gotta do it." Winslet has backed her "Titanic" co-star Leonardo DiCaprio to win the best actor Oscar this year for "The Revenant". Both have been honored this awards season, reuniting on the red carpet, much to the delight of "Titanic" fans, something that surprised Winslet. "It's crazy but it's wonderful how people still get such a kick out of the ("Titanic" characters) Jack and Rose combo." — Reuters

Amazon natives turn film

ilbio Torres had never been to the cinema before and had never heard of the Oscars, until he acted in a film that got nominated for one. The 30-year-old father of four from the Amazon jungle is one of the indigenous Colombian stars of "Embrace of the Serpent," up for the Best Foreign Language Film award at the Oscars on February 28.The third film by Colombian director Ciro Guerra, it is based on the true story of an expedition into the Amazon in the early 20th century by a German ethnologist and a US biologist. But unlike previous tales about European adventures in the South American jungle, this one is told from the viewpoint of the indigenous peoples, who speak in their native languages. "It was hard to get into character," Torres told AFP, struggling to express himself in Spanish. "I had to show it like it was real." Torres, of the Cubeo ethnic group, plays the part of the shaman Karamakate, last survivor of his village, as a young man. Antonio Bolivar, himself one of the last surviving members of the Uitoto ethnic group, plays the character when he is older. The locals call him Grandpa Antonio.

Acting lessons

Nilbio works in the jungle growing yucca and bananas at a plantation he gets to each day by canoe. The hard physical work has given him the kind of body Hollywood actors work on in the gym. When the film crew came to his part of the jungle, he thought of trying to get a job as an assistant on the shoot to earn some extra cash. Instead, the filmmakers offered him a role. They sent him to acting classes in the capital Bogota-the first time he had ever traveled by plane. He did not know much about films, but the filmmakers discovered he had a knack for memorizing his lines and a strong presence in front of the camera. Another indigenous actor, Miguel Ramos, 27,

plays the part of the German explorer's assis-

He is glad that the filmmakers chose to use actors speaking the indigenous Tikuna, Uitoto and Cubeo languages. "A lot of people tell me: 'Thank you for representing us. We feel proud of you," he said. But the film also prompted painful reflections for indigenous people. Their ancestors were massacred by colonial traders who plundered their land for rubber. "Sometimes I would talk with Grandpa Antonio and we would fall silent because we felt sad to be reliving that history in the film," he said."But then you start to reflect that this can allow us to make our lives and communities stronger. This film lets us keep breathing."

Colombia's 'unknown universe'

The rubber trade transformed the Amazon, says Ignacio Prieto, an anthropologist who advised the film director."There was a massacre of 60,000 Uitotos. Indigenous communities fled to Brazil and Peru," he said. Many trees were cut down and natives have turned to mining or growing coca leaves for which drug dealers pay well. Many of them try to shut themselves off from the outside, said Prieto. Ramos is an exception. He has moved to Bogota and is studying to be a sports teacher.

At the university, people ask him whether indigenous people still wear loincloths. "That makes me think that a lot of people do not know the Amazon," he said with a smile. "Embrace of the Serpent" could change that. "The Amazon is an unknown universe for Colombians," said Prieto. "Now the country has realized that this place is here and it belongs to them too." — AFP

In 'The Witch,' a haunting prequel to Salem

et under gray Puritan skies in a deathly autumn, "The Witch" is a slow-burning 1600s horror thriller so bone-dry it would only take a match for the whole movie to go up in flames. "A New England folktale" is how the opening titles describe writer-director Robert Eggers' impressively rigorous feature debut. The film doesn't just take place in early 17th century America, but it has effectively summoned the nightmares and superstitions of the era, much of which Eggers faithfully reproduced from various historical sources.

The subject here is less witches as some supernatural fright than the Puritan psychology that dreamed them. Do not expect broomsticks. A family, led by a prideful patriarch, William (Ralph Ineson, terrific), is banished from the plantation after his stubborn refusal to accept common law as above his own, superior piety. "I would be glad of it," he seethes when threatened with expulsion.

Child vanishes

Our images of the settlement are fleeting. The eldest of the five children, Thomasin (Anya Taylor-Joy, in a breakout performance) peers backward as the wooden gates close behind them as they ride out. The picture is drained of color and the score (by Mark Korven) is eerie and discordant: trouble waits outside the gates. After setting up a scrappy existence in the wilderness, misfortunes mount. The crops die and when Thomasin takes the newborn out near the forest, the child vanishes. That night, after frantic searching, an image flickers of a witch-like figure floating toward a full moon. A spell of mysterious source seems to have settled over the family that spookily manifests in various farm animals: a rabbit in the woods, a bloody chick in an egg. Eventually, a goat and a crow get in on the act. A suitably creepy set of toddler twins is here, too. As things get steadily worse and demons seem literally at the door, the faith of the family is tested. Suspicions begin falling on Thomasin, a fair, pale-white girl whose growth into womanhood is drawing the curious gaze of her younger brother, Caleb (Harvey Scrimshaw). Could she be a witch?


Live deliciously

The spell is cast over the viewer, too, as the authentically resurrected world of "The Witch" transports to a time of suffocating fear, born out of a harsh new land and hardened religious fervor. Taking place decades before the Salem witch trials, "The Witch" is a kind of horror chamber piece, a stripped-bare prequel to the forces that propel Arthur Miller's "The Crucible" and Nathaniel Hawthorne's "The Scarlet Letter." The characters speak in the formal diction of the period - lots of "thees" and such. It's a kind of time travel, for those looking for a far grimmer trip to colonial America than New England tourist attractions afford. It is, to say the least, not a barrel of laughs.

But what makes "The Witch" more than a mere museum reclamation project is Taylor-Joy. The movie is in many ways seen through Thomasin, who stands apart from her devote family. Wide-eyed and rebellious, she more resembles a girl of today. Whether she is, in fact, a witch remains in suspense. But we witness how Puritan paranoia and misogyny turns a pretty young woman like Thomasin into a fearsome seductress in the eyes of her family. When the combustible "The Witch" finally lets itself ablaze, the brutal and surprisingly sober finale is also - and more thrillingly -Thomasin's awakening. Drawn by the lure to break

Regal German Shorthaired Pointer wins Westminster show

he Westminster Dog show went elegant for its 140th installment late Tuesday, picking a German Shorthaired Pointer as its best in show over shaggier options. California Journey, nicknamed CJ, won out over six other finalists to nab one of the most prestigious crowns in dogdom. Among the runners-up were fan favorites Magic, a bright-eyed German Shepherd, and the lumbering Annabelle, a Bulldog that drew especially emphatic cheers from the crowd.

The fuzziest finalist was Mr Charlie, a horizontal mass of grey and black wagging fur, while the toy entry, Panda, a Shih Tzu, drew the broadest laughs with an ill-timed shake of the hips that required a speedy coif-adjustment. In the end, Best in Show judge Richard Meen, a Toronto psychiatrist with more than 50 years in the purebred dog world, picked the stately CJ over the motley crew of elite canines.

"Just a beautiful dog," Meen said afterwards at a news conference with CJ and his breeder, who described the dog's coat as "white-ticked and liver" colored. The breed is also known for its redwood-colored visage and a colt-like physique, traits clearly in evidence as CJ sat calmly. Meen saw in CJ the embodiment of the pointer's core mission of hunting. "This dog never stopped looking," Meen said. "He floated around the ring beautifully." CJ's expression was "alert, bright, not easily distracted." CJ is the third German Shorthaired Pointer to win Westminster and a descendant of the other two champs, including his grandmother "Carlee," who won in 2005, said his co-breeder, co-owner and handler, Valerie Nunes-Atkinson.

The three-year-old CJ only began showing six months ago, but Nunes-Atkinson sensed immediately he was a natural. "When he was born, he was an old soul," she said. "Six weeks old, we knew there was something special." Nunes-Atkinson is a second-generation breeder and grew up with champion dogs, describing her evolution as initially trepidatious around the champions before coming to accept



them as dogs. "In the ring, he's very serious," she said of CJ. "At home, he's silly. He rips around our property with his best-friend, Ramona," a whippet. "He gets into messes." Winning Westminster "is something I've dreamed of since I was 10 years old," she said, adding that she was in a state of

Love, rage, silence: Secret lives of Afghanistan's female poets

ith her kohl-rimmed eyes cast down, Nadia lilts through a folk couplet before a secret assembly of women poets on a forbidden subject that often gets people killed in Afghanistan-love. "Like a candle I burn all night, separated from my lover," the 20-year-old intones in Pashto. "I melt and fade like hot wax." The young university student is part of Mirman Baheer, a women's literary society that holds secret gatherings in Kandahar city, the spiritual birthplace of the famously misogynistic Taliban. Her ode to love is a landay, two-line Pashtun folk poems that have become a symbol of cultural rebellion for women and an outlet for incendiary issues, from child brides to honor killings.

They are more commonly about romantic lovesometimes overlapping with sex, marriage and heartache-in a tightly gender-segregated society where any public display of it is seen as a shocking breach of tradition.

"Who will marry a woman who indulges in love poetry?" said Nadia, quoting her mother who forbade her from joining the poetry club. "People instantly judge: 'She writes about love, she must be a woman of loose morals." News of the meetings has spread by word of mouth, but mobile phones are increasingly used to organize the clandestine gatherings.

Single women and housewives swaddled in brightly coloured headscarves come together in a basement room for the poetry reading, some of them risking punishment or even death if discovered. A few were accompanied by their little sisters to help fabricate convincing alibis when they return home. And for those too afraid to defy their families, Mirman Baheer offers a hotline service for women to call clandestinely and leave their landays, which are read out during weekly sessions.

'Killed for celebrating love'

The underground gathering offers a glimpse into the hidden world of Afghan women flouting patriarchal mores in the country's conflict-torn Pashtun heartland. "Landays, with the power of their grief, love, rage, defy any facile notion of a Pashtun woman as a mute ghost beneath a blue burqa," said Eliza Griswold, author of "I am the Beggar of the World: Landays from Contemporary Afghanistan". "Thousands of years old, these remarkable folk poems provide outsiders a means to explore the inner world of a culture that can be hard to access." Nearly 15 years since the Taliban Islamist regime was ousted from power in a USled invasion, Afghanistan has witnessed a sea change in women's rights, with female lawmakers and even pilots now commonplace.

But gender parity remains a distant dream amid pervasive conservative attitudes that still deride women as "Naqis-ul-aqal" (having a weaker intellect than men) and deem that a female voice should be forbidden in public spaces. "Morality protectors in Afghan society believe that male honor can be protected only by locking away women where nobody can see or hear them," said poet and writer Waheed Warasta.

"Women who dare to step out to recite poetry do so at the risk of being labeled as prostitutes." In 2010, a teenage poet known by her nickname Zarmina set herself on fire after a violent altercation with her brothers who caught her reading a love poem over the phone and presumed there was a boy on the other end of the line. A resident of Gereshk district in the Taliban insurgency-wracked province of Helmand, Zarmina was a regular caller to Mirman Baheer's poetry helpline and later died of her burns in hospital. She is glorified within the club as a "poet martyr". "We live in a country where people get killed for celebrating

love," said Pakeza Arzo, a Kabul-based coordinator at Mirman Baheer, who transcribes landays from anonymous callers.

'Antidote to heartbreak'

The club's weekly gatherings in Kabul are held openly and attract elite university professors, law-makers and journalists, but its meetings in conservative areas such as Kandahar and Helmand are held under a tight veil of secrecy. Mobile phones can provide a lifeline. Arzo said some rural women who have no freedom to step out of their homes break down over the phone, their poems giving vent to a torrent of anguish.

"Landays reflect their struggles and work like an antidote to heartbreak," Arzo said. One caller, who calls in regularly, left this landay: "When my husband took a second wife, I burned / I no longer care about the flames of hell." Another bemoaned the stoning of a young woman accused of adultery. "For whose sin am I sacrificed to tradition / My biggest crime is that I am a woman." And one caller from Khost province bordering Pakistan was unabashedly bold, her landay laced with contempt for the prevalent machismo culture. "You demand a kiss by force /Night will give way to dawn, but you shall not have my lips." For many, going out of their homes to buy mobile phone credit is akin to traversing a minefield. They are fearful of getting caught and some call from a different number every time. And it usually ends with a familiar pattern: after a while, the calls abruptly stop, Arzo said. "This sudden silence can only mean two things: either the poet has been killed or married off." — AFP

Newfound Mozart-Salieri cantata premieres after 200-year silence

ost for over 200 years, a cantata co-written by classical maestros Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Antonio Salieri rang out in public for the first time Tuesday, shedding new light on their reputed intense rivalry. The Italian composer was allegedly so jealous of the Austrian prodigy that he once tried to poison him-a claim rejected by experts as the collaboration was performed in Prague. "The part composed by Mozart is, shall we say, more ingenious and dramatic, while the other two verses are more lyrical," musician Lukas Vendl told reporters after playing the four-minute composition on a harpsichord.

"But it's impossible to deduce from it who was a better composer." The cantata from 1785 is "key to a new understanding of the relationship between Mozart and Salieri," according to Timo Jouko Herrmann, the German musicologist and composer who found the work. Herrmann said it suggests the men were "colleagues who worked together" rather than rivals and undermines a legend suggesting Salieri may have played a role in Mozart's untimely death at 36 in 1791. Titled "Per la ricuperata salute di Offelia" (To Ophelia's health) the cantata was jointly composed by Mozart, Salieri and an unknown musician named Cornetti.

It accompanies a libretto by Italian poet Lorenzo Da Ponte and is dedicated to popular English soprano Nancy Storace (1765-1817), who returned to the stage after losing her voice for a spell. The score lay unidentified in the Czech Museum of Music since the 1950s but Herrmann was finally able to attribute it to the two composers thanks to access to new information on the Internet, according to a museum statement. Scores of the cantata had been distributed at the time

by a Viennese merchant, Artaria and Comp. The Prague copy is the only one to have survived.

False portrayal

The discovery is especially interesting in light of a legend discounted by historians: Salieri was said to have fatally poisoned Mozart out of jealousy over the Austrian wunderkind's talent First appearing in Alexander Pushkin's 19th-century poetic drama "Mozart and Salieri," the rumour was later featured in the play and 1984 film "Amadeus", which historians say grossly exaggerated Salieri's rivalry with Mozart. "We all know the film 'Amadeus.' Salieri is mischaracterized in it," said Ulrich Leisinger from the International Mozarteum Foundation in Salzburg.

"He didn't poison Mozart. The two composers regularly met up and collaborated in Vienna." The film was shot in the Czech capital, where Mozart spent considerable time in the 18th century as it was then part of the Austrian Empire. Prague played host to the premiere of his celebrated opera Don Giovanni in October 1787, which later had a lukewarm reception in the empire's capital Vienna. Mozart debuted another opera, The Clemency of Titus, in Prague in 1791. This year marks the 260th anniversary of Mozart's birth and the 225th anniversary of his death. "As far as I know, it's the only piece jointly written by Mozart and Salieri," said Herrmann. "But who knows: in a treasure house like this, anything can happen," he said of Prague's music museum. — AFP
