

MPS EXTEND PROBE OVER DISTRIBUTION OF AGRICULTURAL LAND

KUWAIT: Tempers flared in the National Assembly session yesterday when a number of MPs quarreled during a heated debate over amendments to the municipality law. Strong arguments broke out when the government insisted that the addition of new residential areas to existing electoral districts for the municipal council should be done by the government through an Amiri decree and it should be included in the law.

MP Hamdan Al-Azemi and some other MPs objected saying the whole article in the law was rejected in the last session and should not have been brought up for debate. Azemi then angrily protested at the voting to approve the government's request, saying this is not a real assembly and MPs are not real men.

That triggered a reaction from MP Ali Al-Khamees who shouted back at Azemi, insisting that the lawmakers are real men. MP Hamad Al-Harshani also got himself involved in the heated exchanges by accusing Azemi of disrupting the assembly session. At this point, Azemi throew a book at Khamees but missed him to hit MP Mohammad Al-Huwailah.

MP Sultan Al-Shimmari then took part in the quarrel by shouting at Azemi to stop. The two lawmakers then threw shoes at each other as many other MPs came to prevent them from reaching each other. Speaker Marzouk Al-Ghanem then stopped the proceedings and ordered the assembly hall to be vacated.

A few minutes later, Al-Ghanem resumed the session and said that Azemi apologized to other MPs and the whole issue was now over. But Azemi insisted that the apologies were reciprocal and it did not come from him alone.

Shortly afterwards, the assembly voted to approve the government's request and the whole municipality law which prompted MP Azemi to walk out of the session which was immediately closed by the speaker. **Continued on Page 13**

RAMADAN AND CONSUMPTION

amadan provides Muslims with a yearly transforming experience that shape their personality and life outlook. Ramadan acquires a very special taste in modern times as it emerges as a potential remedy for what is seen as a social malady by many experts, ie consumerism. One of the biggest challenges in our world today is the consumerism culture that has invaded every aspect of our life. Everything is within reach and people are constantly looking for the latest trends and fashion. We are more eager to accumulate more riches. Indulgence in consumption often comes at the expense of the soul and people start to forget the true purpose of life. True to the words of the Prophet (Peace Be Upon Him), this consumerism destroyed us. In a hadeeth, the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) said, "By Allah, it is not the poverty about which I fear in regard to you but I am afraid in your case that (the worldly) riches may be given to you as were given to those who had gone before you and you begin to vie with one another for them as they vied for them. And these may destroy you as these destroyed them." (Muslim, Book # 042, Hadith #7065).

There is a remarkable and noticeable tendency creeping into Muslim community to turn religious events into shopping festivals. Before Ramadan approaches, shopping festivals and discounts on all sorts of goods are everywhere and people are encouraged to consume more at time when they are, supposedly, expected to use less. People buy more amounts of food than they consume on the average. The advertising world promises people more comfort and luxury, which ultimately leads to covert slavery. Just as Christmas has been turned into a huge selling and consuming event in the West, one may fear something similar for Ramadan.

Ramadan's first mission is to help Muslims attain self-restraint and subdue their desires, whims and lusts, whether it is food, drinks, sex or even time-consuming technology such as smart phones.

tenced to 100 lashes for having **Continued on Page 13** ORLANDO: Police revealed new details on the agonizing three-hour stand-off and brutal end to the Orlando gay club massacre yesterday as America grappled with the implications of the worst terror attack on its soil since 9/11. The Islamic State group claimed slain shooter Omar Mateen was acting as "one of the soldiers of the caliphate in America" when he attacked the Pulse club in the central Florida city, a siege that ended when police stormed the venue.

But investigators are probing whether he was a jihadist on a mission or a vicious "lone wolf" inspired by the group's propaganda to carry out what President Barack Obama dubbed "an act of terror and an act of hate." Forty-nine people were killed and 53 others wounded in the attack, which was also the

deadliest mass shooting in US history. The slaughter triggered worldwide shock and outrage, but has also raised questions about US counter-terror strategy and gun laws. The suspect was allowed to legally buy a rifle and handgun despite raising red Afghan descent, called police in the midst of Islamic State group, and the FBI admitted it expressed homophobic views. had previously investigated him but cleared

MICROSOFT ACQUIRES LinkedIn for \$26bn

WASHINGTON: Microsoft said yesterday it was buying the professional social network LinkedIn for \$26.2 billion in cash, a move that helps refocus the US tech giant around cloud computing and services.

With its biggest-ever acquisition and one of the largest in the tech sector, Microsoft takes a big step into the world of social networking and adds a new tool for its efforts to boost services for business. "This deal brings together the world's leading professional cloud with the world's leading professional network," Microsoft chief executive Satya Nadella said in a statement.

"It's clear to me that the LinkedIn team has grown a fantastic business and an impressive network of more than 433 mil-

lion professionals." According to a statement from the two firms, LinkedIn "will retain its distinct

brand, culture and independence," with Jeff Weiner remaining at CEO of LinkedIn. "Just as we have changed the way the world connects to opportunity, this relationship with Microsoft, and the combination of their cloud and LinkedIn's network, now gives us a chance to also change the

way the world works," Weiner said. The two firms said they had reached a "definitive" agreement that would close later this year, with the support of LinkedIn chairman and controlling shareholder Reid Hoffman. The move comes with Microsoft moving away from being a pure software firm, and LinkedIn seeking ways to boost growth. LinkedIn, which enables members to connect with similarminded professionals and facilitates recruiting and job hunting, has carved out a social network with a distinct identity.

KUWAIT PROSECUTOR WANTS 29-YEAR TERM FOR CONVICTED ROYALS

KUWAIT: Kuwait's public prosecutor wants an appeals court to increase a sentence handed down to three royals for insulting the authorities from five years to 29, according to remarks published yesterday.

Dherar Al-Asoussi said he had petitioned the court also to convict the men of using social media to insult the Gulf state's ruler. A lower court last month sentenced the three royals, including a nephew of HH the Amir, and two others to five years in jail for insulting top judges online. It also sentenced a sixth man to one year and another to 10 years in absentia. Six

more were acquitted. All were acquitted of the charge of insulting HH the Amir. Asoussi told Al-Qabas newspaper he has challenged the rulings and demanded that all 13 defendants be given harsher jail terms of up to 29 years each for insulting HH the Amir, judges and spreading false news about Kuwait. The appeals court has not yet set a date for the hearing. Its rulings must be verified by the supreme court.

The royals given jail terms include Sheikh Athbi Al-Fahad Al-Sabah, HH the Amir's nephew and a former head of the secret service police. The convicted men remain free but the interior ministry said yesterday security forces raided Sheikh Athbi's house but he was not







FUND WANTS TO SELL FRENCH NUCLEAR GROUP AREVA STAKE

PARIS: Sovereign wealth fund Kuwait Investment Authority (KIA) has told French authorities it wants to sell its stake in nuclear group Areva, La Lettre de l'Expansion reported yesterday. KIA is Areva's second-biggest shareholder with a 4.82 percent stake, according to Thomson Reuters data.

The newsletter said the Kuwaiti fund had complained that its investment in Areva, which is majority owned by the French government, was made based on incorrect company accounts. French Industry Minister Emmanuel Macron and Areva declined to comment on the report. KIA was not immediately available for comment.

KIA paid 600 million euros (\$676 million) for the stake in 2010, but since then Areva shares have plunged by about 90 percent as the firm's equity has been wiped out by years of losses. Areva will be rescued by a 5 billion euro state-funded capital increase and its nuclear reactor unit will be taken

over by state-owned utility EDF later this year or early next year. The French state holds about 87 percent of Areva's capital.

KIA or other minority shareholders have never publicly complained about Areva's accounts, but former Areva chief executive Anne Lauvergeon was put under formal investigation last month for her role in the 2007 acquisition of uranium mining firm Uramin. In France, a formal investigation does not automatically

lead to a trial but often does.

Lauvergeon has repeatedly denied any wrongdoing and has said that asset depreciations at Uramin were partly due to the collapse of uranium prices after the Fukushima nuclear disaster in Japan in March 2011. Areva has had to write down billions of euros on Uramin, which contributed to years of losses and eventually wiped out its equity, leading to a state rescue package early this

LAWYER FILES FIRST CHALLENGE **AGAINST DNA LAW**

KUWAIT: A lawyer yesterday filed a case at the constitutional court questioning the constitutionality of the DNA law; the first of its kind in Kuwait. The lawyer based his challenge on grounds that Kuwait's constitution states that penalties should be limited to the individual, while the DNA law calls for sending parents to prison if any of their children refuse to take the needed DNA tests.

Blast anniversary

On the first anniversary of the Imam Al-Sadeq Mosque bombing, chairman of the parliamentary priorities committee MP Yousef Al-Zalzalah issued a press release commemorating the martyrs who fell at the mosque. He also condemned the terrorist act that targeted people while they were praying, with the aim of dividing Kuwaitis and creating sectarian tumult amongst them. "Kuwait's reaction was very shocking to the terrorist groups, as His Highness the Amir acted in a fatherly manner and rushed to the scene immediately," he said.

Fourth floor

Municipal Council member and head of Hawally committee Yousef Al-Ghareeb suggested allowing citizens to build a fourth floor in private and model residential areas because many families have grown larger and need the extra space. "The municipality had been turning a blind eye to this violation for years, so why not allow building a fourth floor according to reasonable conditions?" he asked. Current regulations bans building more than three floors for houses in residential areas.

The council, during its regular session of the 11th term, approved the meeting minutes of the special needs committee; whereby the members affirmed necessity of providing services for this segment of the society by the government departments, noting existence of shortcomings in the construction legislations and government services. —KUNA

Kuwait condemns Orlando shooting

KUWAIT: The State of Kuwait on Sunday strongly condemned the terrorist attack in the US city of Orlando, Florida, that killed and wounded over 100 people. These criminal acts "pose a grave harm to Islam, and are distant from its noble teachings," a foreign ministry source said. The escalation of terrorist acts, he said, required the international community's doubling of efforts to eliminate "this disgusting phenomenon and ridding the world from its evil." The source reaffirmed Kuwait's rejection to all types of terrorism. —KUNA

KFAED funds \$1.6 billion projects

KUWAIT: Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) said in a report yesterday that the total water and irrigation projects it funded around the globe since establishment have reached about 100 projects worth more than \$1.6 billion. The fund's contribution to support these projects came from its conviction in achieving sustainable development, taking into consideration the water shortages and environmental challenges facing the world, the KFAED report said. The fund works to support basic development sectors, said the report, adding that during the past five decades it offered the necessary support for the implementation of about 800 projects in more than 100 countries with a total value of about \$17 billion. —KUNA



POLICE FIND GUNS, AMMO AT FUGITIVE'S HOUSE

KUWAIT: The Ministry of Interior's Relations and Security Media Department announced that security forces raided the house of Sheikh Athbi Fahd Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah to arrest him in implementation of a court ruling in the infamous 'Fintas Group' case, in which he was sentenced to five years in prison. Sheikh Athbi could not be found at his house, the ministry announced, adding that he has been in hiding since the ruling was made. However, security sources said that the force found a Kalashnikov (AK-47) rifle, a gun, four loaded magazines and live ammunition in the house, which were all confiscated and legal measures were accordingly taken. The court had sentenced Sheikh Athbi and two other royals, as well as two others to five years in jail for insulting top judges online.

Vice practices

Eighteen Filipinos were arrested for vice practices at various massage parlors yesterday, said security sources. Case papers indicate that residency detectives had been tipped off concerning indecent practices in some massage parlors in Salmiya. Accordingly, three of these centers were raided and the suspects were arrested red-handed. They were immediately referred to health facilities to be medically examined and make sure they are free of infectious diseases.

Woman hurt in fire

A fire broke out in a Rawda house, said security sources, noting that firemen from Shuhada and Hawally rushed to the scene where they evacuated and ventilated the house before controlling the fire. An elderly woman had to be rushed to hospital for smoke inhalation. Another fire broke out in a Wafra farm, said security sources, noting that firemen rushed to the scene and had to call police to break open the farm gate because the guard was not present. Firemen found that the fire started in a pile of wood and it was easily controlled without any casualties and before spreading to adjacent farms.

Motorist injured

A citizen was severely injured when he lost control over his vehicle and it flipped between Qasour and Adan, said security sources, noting that a special squad was dispatched to the scene and found that after rolling over several times, the vehicle landed on the highway metal railing. Inspecting the vehicle, the driver was not found inside because he had been thrown out. Separately, a vehicle caught fire along Abdaly highway, said security sources, noting that Jahra firefighters rushed to the scene and controlled the fire. The driver was unharmed.

ost things, not all of them, are usually beautiful, but the beauty gets deformed by the way people use them. This includes satellite TV channels that were introduced to the Arab world by the 1990s. Those channels were something great, but used by some people in a way that disfigured them and turned them into something more harmful than useful. These channels were destroyed not only by some

programs that are keen on slander and arguments, but also by some presenters who love making more and more money, regardless of how it is earned.

These program presenters would scrape their societies and bring out the worst to show on TV through local and satellite broadcasts, which

destroys the country's image abroad. They must differentiate between local broadcasts addressing citizens within the same country and satellite ones that can been watched by people worldwide. Not all that is fit for domestic use is fit for the outer world. All societies worldwide may suffer from certain problems and many of those problems should not be shown outside the country's borders, because this would abuse the country of origin.

Foreign viewers usually get beautiful ideas about countries, their natural beauty, their clean streets, their people's kindness and generosity and hospitality on hosting others - all of which are beautiful images that remain in their minds and memories. However, they may sometimes be

shocked and their opinions about a certain country may change into negative ones on watching some disfiguring and defaming images on satellite TV channels.

Owners of satellite TV channels must tell the difference between programs that are good for local consumption and others good for broadcast abroad. In this regard, I still

remember when the late former minister of information Sheikh Saud Nasser Al-Sabah restricted TV coverage of parliamentary sessions to local broadcasts only with the excuse that such matters were "local affairs that are not for

Woman causes scare after leaving bag in mosque

KUWAIT: Detectives and state security are looking for an unidentified woman who created fear and chaos among worshippers in Andalus when she asked them to say the shahada (the Islamic declaration of faith), left a bag and fled. A security source said a call was received from worshippers who said the fully veiled woman came in, left the bag and asked them to recite the shahada. The bag did not contain any illegal substance.

Compatriots' row

Abu Halifa police arrested an Egyptian man in Mangaf following a complaint from a compatriot accusing him of having a relationship with his wife and threatening to kill him. The Egyptian, who is a teacher, also accused the suspect of encouraging his wife to get a divorce. He said he gave her pills to have an abortion, and threatened to kill her husband (him) if they go to Egypt by hitmen there. A security source said the suspect's place was raided and he was arrested after refusing to go to the police station.

Costly gable

Three Indians were caught gambling in a Khaitan yard and were referred to residency detectives. The arrests were made when the three fled as soon as they saw police. They will be deported.

Not paid

A citizen who owns an Instagram account through which she sells branded items complained to Hawally police against a woman who ordered two purses and a watch, but when the driver delivered them, she did not pay. Police checked the woman's details and found she is an Iranian. Police will summon and question her.

Woman robbed

An Egyptian woman told Salmiya police that she was robbed by another woman inside a beauty salon. The Egyptian said she does not know the woman, who entered the shop soon after opening, immobilized her - injuring her in the process - and stole KD 520. Descriptions of the car the suspect was driving were noted by police.

Illicit relationship

A call about the kidnapping of a child in Salwa revealed an illicit relationship between a maid and a Lebanese man that resulted in pregnancy out of wedlock. CLUB SHOOTER WAS A BODY BUILDER, SECURITY GUARD

'HE WAS MENTALLY UNSTABLE AND MENTALLY ILL'

FORT PIERCE, Florida: He was a body builder and a security guard, a religious man who attended the local mosque and wanted to become a police officer. Early Sunday, 29-year-old Omar Mateen opened fire at a gay nightclub in Orlando. Police said 49 victims died and 53 were wounded. Mateen also was killed.

Mateen was the son of an Afghan immigrant who had a talk show in the United States, the nature of which was not entirely clear: A former Afghan official said the program was pro-Taleban and a former colleague said it was enthusiastically pro-American.

He attended evening prayer services at the city's Islamic Center three to four times a week, most recently with his young son, said Imam Syed Shafeeq Rahman. Although he was not very social, he also showed no signs of violence,

Rahman said. He said he last saw Mateen on Friday.

"When he finished prayer he would just leave," Rahman told The Associated Press. "He would not socialize with anybody. He would be quiet. He would be very peaceful." He was also bipolar, Mateen's ex-wife, Sitora Yusufiy, told reporters in Boulder, Colorado. "He was mentally unstable and mentally ill," Yusufiy said. Although records show the couple didn't divorce for two years after the marriage, Yusiufiy said she was actually only with Mateen for four months because he was abusive. She said he would not let her speak to her family and that family members had to come and literally pull her out of his arms.

'Nothing to do with IS'

Authorities immediately began investigating whether Sunday's attack was an act of terrorism. A law enforcement official said the gunman made a 911 call from the nightclub professing allegiance to the leader of the Islamic State, Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi.

The law enforcement official is familiar with the investigation but was not authorized to discuss the matter publicly and spoke on condition of anonymity. Yusufiy said she was "devastated, shocked, started shaking and crying" when she heard about the shooting, but she attributed the violence to Mateen's mental illness, not any alliance with terrorist groups. Rahman agreed.

"My personal opinion is that this has nothing to do with ISIS," he said. Seddique Mir Mateen, the father of the alleged shooter, is a life insurance salesman who started a group in 2010 called Durand Jirga, Inc, according to Qasim Tarin, a businessman from California who was a Durand Jirga board member. The name refers to the Durand line, the long disputed border between Afghanistan and Pakistan. Tarin said Seddique Mir Mateen had a television show on which they discussed issues facing Afghanistan. "It's shocking," he said about the shooting. "(Omar Mateen's) father loves this country." Some of Seddique Mir Mateen's shows were taped and later posted on YouTube. During one episode, a sign in the background read: "Long live the USA! Long live Afghanistan. ... Afghans are the best friends to the USA."

But a former Afghan official said the "Durand Jirga Show" appears on Payam-e-Afghan, a California-based channel that supports ethnic solidarity with the Afghan Taliban, which are mostly Pashtun. Viewers from Pashtun communities in the United States regularly call in to the channel to espouse support for Pashtun domination of Afghanistan over the nation's minorities, including Hazaras, Tajiks and Uzbeks, the official said.

The "Durand Jirga Show" expresses support for the Taleban, has an anti-Pakistan slant, complains about foreigners in Afghanistan and criticizes US actions there, the

official said. Seddique Mir Mateen lavished praise on current Afghan President Ashraf Ghani when he appeared on the show in January 2014, but he has since denounced the Ghani government, according to the official, who said that on Saturday, Seddique Mateen appeared on the show dressed in military fatigues and used his program to criticize the current Afghan government. He also announced on that show that he would run in the next Afghan presidential election, said the official, who spoke only on condition of anonymity because he did not want to be linked to coverage of the shooting.

Inflammatory comments


In 2013, Omar Mateen made inflammatory comments to co-workers, and he was interviewed twice, FBI agent Ronald Hopper said. He called those interviews inconclusive. In

2014, Hopper said, officials found that Mateen had ties to an American suicide bomber. He described the contact as minimal, saying it did not constitute a threat at the time. Mateen purchased at least two firearms legally within the last week or so, according to Trevor Velinor of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. Mateen had no criminal record. Yusufiy said he wanted to be a police officer and had applied to the police academy. Mateen was a security guard at the G4S company, which identifies itself on its website as "the leading global integrated security company."

Daniel Gilroy told multiple news outlets that he worked with Mateen at G45. Gilroy called him an angry, loud, profane man who used slurs for gay people, blacks, Jews and women. "He never used other words to describe them," Gilroy told the Tampa Bay Times. Mateen also regularly made threats of violence, according to Gilroy.

"He talked about killing people all the time," Gilroy told The New York Times. And Gilroy wasn't surprised when he learned of the massacre: "I saw it coming." Gilroy said Mateen started badgering him and sending dozens of text messages to him daily. Gilroy said he reported Mateen's behavior to his bosses.

"I kind of feel a little guilty that I didn't fight harder," Gilroy said. "If I didn't walk away and I fought, then maybe 50 people would still be alive today." But Rahman said Mateen was not, as far as the imam could see, someone who would ever commit such a gruesome act of mass violence. Rahman said he knew Mateen and his family since the shooter was a young boy. Playful as a child, he became more serious as an adult, Rahman said. He spoke both English and Farsi, and was into body building "It was totally unexpected," Rahman said. —AP

A QUEST TO DOCUMENT IS MASSACRE OF IRAQI YAZIDIS

COMPILING EVIDENCE FOR A FUTURE CRIMINAL PROSECUTION

DOHUK, Iraq: The walls and even the windows of Bahzad Farhan Murad's office are covered with lists. They name the thousands of people who were killed or are still missing after the Islamic State group launched an attack on unarmed Yazidi communities in northwestern Iraq nearly two

The 28-year-old Yazidi has been documenting crimes against his community ever since the August 2014 attack. He is collecting data

record. "I'm pretty sure that if we don't do it now, after 20 years noone will remember. And they will say, 'nothing happened to the Yazidis," he said.

Religious minority

Iraq's Yazidi community - a small and isolated religious minority that combines elements of Islam, Zoroastrism and Christianity - has been repeatedly persecuted by successive governments and invading armies. Murad's quest for detail magnifies what already seems a monumental task. He photographed each item the woman had with her when she escaped, as he does with all the women he interviews. The pictures go into the victim's file, along with the description of their case and other personal details. Alongside the case files, his home garage has many boxes of these items: the clothes they were wearing, bags, water bottles, even small bank notes.

He says he's aware of the danger of taking on too big a task, but he doesn't think there is another way to document the extent of the atrocity. "Everything - the massacres, the disappearances - is connected with everything else. It has to be documented in its entirety," he said. Murad works independently and is self-funded, helped by a few volunteers. Coming from a well-off family, he says he doesn't have to worry about money and

AID GROUP SAYS 4,000 MORE FLEE FALLUJAH

BAGHDAD: More than 4,000 people have fled the Islamic State-held city of Fallujah in Iraq after government forces retook a key road to the IS stronghold over the weekend, an aid group said on yesterday.

Along with roadside bombs planted by the militants, an estimated number of 50.000 civilians who remain trapped inside Fallujah, located about 40 miles west of Baghdad, have slowed down the Iraqi forces' operation to recapture the city. Fallujah has been under IS control for over two years the last major city in western Iraq still held by the extremist group. The militants have threatened anyone who attempts to flee with death and last week they reportedly shot at a group of civilians attempting to flee across the Euphrates River.

The Norwegian Refugee Council, which works with refugees and internally displaced Iraqis, said the 4,000 who fled since Saturday bring the total number of residents who escaped Fallujah since the Iraqi offensive

started in late May to 27,580.

Thousands more are expected to take the risky journey in the coming hours, NRC said, adding that some refugees reported IS militants were demanding 150,000 Iraqi Dinars, or around \$130, from each person to let them leave. The aid group warned that humanitarian resources are running low and called for at least \$10 million for a six months' supply of water, food and basic

"Thousands of others remain trapped inside and the most vulnerable will need urgent assistance," said NRC Country Director in Iraq Nasr Muflahi. On Sunday, the Iraqi command announced that key areas to the west of Fallujah have been taken and that Iragi forces pushed deeper into the city from its southern edges. US-trained Iraqi counterterrorism forces, wary of coming street battles in the city, are already facing fierce resistance on the outskirts from wellentrenched militants. —AP

ARMED CLASHES IN IRAN KILL 10 MILITANTS, POLICEMAN

TEHRAN: Ten militants and a police officer sion later yesterday reported six more have been killed in separate armed clashes in Iran, local media reported yesterday. Iran's elite Revolutionary Guards killed five Kurdish rebels near the country's northwestern border with Iraq, an official statement said. "A team of five from the PJAK terrorist splinter group... has been identified and destroyed in the Sardasht region" on the Iraqi border, a Guards statement

It said the group was responsible for the death of three members of Iran's Basij militia more than a month ago. No further details were provided about the operation. The last reported clashes between Kurdish rebels and the Revolutionary Guards were in September, when two rebels and two Iranian soldiers were killed. State televideaths in armed clashes in the southeastern Sistan-Baluchistan province. One police officer and five militants were killed in the fighting, which pitted Iranian forces against the Sunni militant group Jaish-ul Adl.

Officials recovered "large amounts of explosives" after the clashes, state television website said. Tehran accuses Jaish-ul Adl of having links with Al-Qaeda. The group has conducted several armed attacks inside Iranian territory in recent years. PJAK-the Party of Free Life of Kurdistan-is an Iranian Kurdish party with close links to the Turkish Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK). Kurdish rebels periodically attack Iranian armed forces near the border with Iraq's Kurdish region. —AFP

LIBYAN GOVT ADVANCE SLOWS AS IS HITS BACK

SIRTE: An intense fight back by the Islamic State group in Libya's Sirte slowed an advance by progovernment forces yesterday into the jihadists' North African stronghold. Forces allied with Libya's unity government made rapid gains in Sirte last week, pushing IS out of the port and the airport on the edges of the coastal city, 450 kilometres east of the capital Tripoli.

But the advance, under cover of air strikes and heavy artillery, slowed as pro-government fighters reached residential areas near the city centre. Most of Sirte's residents have fled but officials have said some 30,000 civilians remain in the city. "We are trying to advance slowly today," a member of the operations command told AFP. "There are no big clashes so far, but the most important thing is that we are trying to

As the fighting degenerated into a street-by-

street battle, IS militants holed up in the central and northern parts of the city hit back with sniper fire, improvised explosives and suicide car bombings. Three IS fighters drove cars laden with explosives at pro-government troops and a field hospital on Sunday, killing at least one fighter and injuring four others, a unity government spokesman told AFP.

A group of pro-government fighters responded by attacking IS positions at the main western entrance to the city on Sunday afternoon. They came under intense fire from the jihadists and withdrew as evening fell, an AFP journalist at the scene reported. A pro-government fighter was injured by sniper fire during the operation and taken out of the area.

But another fighter involved in the battle sounded an upbeat note on the operation. "Our ground forces will advance despite the difficul-

ties," he said. The AFP journalist filmed pro-government fighters firing assault rifles at IS positions from inside buildings on the edge of the city. One fighter was injured and lay on the steps next to building as his colleagues shouted for medical assistance. "The infantry has advanced inside Sirte with a great deal of effort," said Mohammed Al-Fadel, a pro-government fighter.

Unified command

IS-which is estimated to have some 5,000 fighters in Libya-seized control of Sirte last year and turned it into its main base of operations in North Africa. The loss of the city would be a major setback for the group, which has also been losing territory in Syria and Iraq where IS established its self-declared "caliphate" in 2014.

The forces battling to oust the jihadists from Sirte include militias from western cities, notably Misrata, and the guards of eastern oil installations that IS has repeatedly tried to seize. Under the command of Libya's UN-backed Government of National Accord (GNA), they launched the assault on Sirte, the hometown of Libya's ousted dictator Moamer Kadhafi, a month ago.

Directed from a joint command centre in Misrata, 190 kilometers to the northwest, pro-GNA forces have deployed tanks, rocket launchers and artillery in the fight for the city. Forces from Misrata-that have an arsenal that includes MiG fighter jets and attack helicopters-carried out dozens of air raids against IS.

Pro-GNA forces entered Sirte last week, taking the city's port on Friday and advancing on residential areas in the city's east. Following rapid gains, a spokesman for the pro-GNA forces predicted on Thursday the city would fall "in two or three days". But the advance slowed over the weekend, as IS responded with machineguns, mortar rounds and sniper fire, as well as car bombings. According to medical sources in Misrata, at least 140 pro-GNA fighters had been killed and 500 wounded since the operation began on May 12. —AFP

LEBANON BANKS SAY BLAST AIMS TO 'RATTLE' STABILITY

BEIRUT: Lebanese banks yesterday warned that the country's financial sector was at risk after a bomb blast outside a major bank in a western part of the capital. The explosion late Sunday night blew out the entire glass facade of the headquarters of BLOM BANK, one of the country's largest, but only one person was lightly wounded.

After an emergency meeting on Monday morning, the Association of Lebanese Banks condemned the attack, which it said "hurt the entire banking sector and aims to rattle economic stability." "The Association is subject to the applicable Lebanese laws and to the Central Bank's circulars," the statement said. Politicians and local media have linked the attack to a law voted in December by the US Congress to impose sanctions on banks that deal with Hezbollah, considered

a "terrorist group" by the US.

Last month, Lébanon's central bank instructed the country's banks and financial institutions to comply with the new measure against the Lebanese Shiite group. Hezbollah has fiercely criticized the law and accused central bank governor Riad Salameh of "yielding" to Washington's

BLOM BANK yesterday morning said none of the documents stored at its headquarters were damaged in the attack. Interior Minister Nuhad Mashnug told AFP the blast was caused by a bomb containing about 3-4 kilos of explosives. Several Beirut newspapers known to be critical of Hezbollah said the explosion was a "message" to banks complying with the ruling. —AFP

CAMBODIA OPPN ACTIVISTS JAILED FOR 'INSURRECTION'

PHNOM PENH: A Cambodian court yes- terday. The three men were arrested last terday sentenced three more opposition activists to seven years each in prison over their alleged roles in post election protests that turned violent two years ago. The jailings come as political tensions in Cambodia soar with the opposition party embroiled in a sex scandal and strongman Prime Minister Hun Sen accused of carrying out a fresh crackdown against critics.

Three youth members of the Cambodian National Rescue Party (CNRP) were found guilty of insurrection by the Phnom Penh Municipal court yesyear after another 11 opposition officials and activists were jailed on the same charges-including three who received 20-year sentences. The convictions, condemned as politically motivated by rights groups, stem from clashes between protesters and authorities in July 2014 during a demonstration against the closure of Freedom Park, a key site for public rallies in Phnom Penh. Dozens of security officers and several protesters were injured in the clashes. At the time the park was a rallying point for Hun Sen's opponents who accused him

of rigging the previous year's elections.

The CNRP are currently involved in a fresh standoff with the authorities. Secret phone calls allegedly between the party's deputy leader Kem Sokha and a mistress were released earlier this year. He is now wanted for questioning by a court after a prostitution investigation was launched against the woman. But he has refused to be interviewed, arguing that the police investigation is politically motivated.

Targeting critics

He has holed himself up in the CNRP's

Hun Sen's government has denied targeting Kem Sokha but has gone on to arrest dozens of critics in recent weeks. Among them are human rights defenders, environmental campaigners, monks, students, opposition party activists and

Am Sam Ath, of local rights group Licadho, said yesteday's jailing would fuel further political resentment. "The political situation is tense now, and the sentences will add to the heat," he said. In a speech yesterday morning, Hun Sen

COURT TO MULL EXPULSION OF CYBER BULLY SUSPECT

THE HAGUE: An Amsterdam court will today begin deliberating whether to extradite a Dutchman to Canada on charges linked to the cyberbullying of a teenager who committed suicide in 2012. Prosecutors allege the suspect, identified as Aydin C. by Dutch media, blackmailed "dozens" of girls on the Internet into performing lewd acts, threatening to post videos of earlier sex acts if they failed to comply.

He was linked to the case of 15-year-old Amanda Todd, from the Canadian province of British Colombia, who committed suicide in October 2012 after being tormented by an anonymous cyberbully. The teenager's death sparked a debate in Canada and worldwide about appropriate online behaviour, and prompted calls for bullying to be criminalised.

Aydin C. was arrested in January 2014 in the southern Dutch town of Tilburg. Tuesday's hearing "is to examine whether or not to extradite him. The judgement will follow in a couple of weeks," court spokeswoman Soemisa Zeiani told AFP on

The man is suspected of forcing dozens

of young women from as far afield as the United States, Britain and Netherlands into performing sex acts in front of their webcams. In a YouTube video watched by millions worldwide, Todd, 15, said before her death that she suffered from anxiety, "major depression" and panic attacks after a photo of her breasts, flashed in an online video chat with a stranger, was distributed in her community.

She said she withdrew from those around her and turned to drugs and alcohol, and "cried every night." In the video, Todd said she lost friends due to the controversy, suffered a schoolyard beating over a boy and had to change schools several times to escape blackmail. "I have nobody. I need someone," she said.

Aydin C. is currently detained in The Netherlands for producing and disseminating child pornography and his Dutch trial will take place "after the summer," the Amsterdam court spokeswoman added. He is also suspected by the Canadian authorities of extortion, soliciting children on the Internet for sexual purposes, threats and harassment, the Dutch press agency ANP said. — AFP

MAN ARRESTED IN CALIFORNIA WITH RIFLES AND CHEMICALS

SANTA MONICA: Police and FBI agents were working to figure out why a man from Indiana had three assault rifles and chemicals used in making explosives in his car some 2,000 miles from home in Southern California, where he told the officers arresting him that he was headed to a gay pride parade.

Santa Monica police and the FBI, which was leading the investigation, were examining the intentions of James Wesley Howell, 20, who told police he was going to LA Pride in West Hollywood, an event that annually draws hundreds of thousands of people. His arrest came just a few hours after at least 50 people were shot and killed in a gay nightclub in Orlando, Florida, though police said they had found no evidence of a connection between the events.

Howell, of Jeffersonville, was arrested around 5 am after residents called police to report suspicious behavior by a man who parked his white Acura sedan facing the wrong way. When officers arrived they saw an assault rifle sitting in Howell's passenger seat, Santa Monica police Lt Saul Rodriguez said. That prompted them to search the whole car. They found two more assault rifles, high-capacity magazines and ammunition and a five-gallon bucket with chemicals that could be used to make an explosive device, police said.

Santa Monica Police Chief Jacqueline Seabrooks initially tweeted that Howell told officers he wanted to "harm" the gay pride event, but she later corrected her statement to say only that Howell said he was going to the parade. A Facebook page that apparently is Howell's includes photos of the white Acura he was driving in Santa Monica. The postings are unremarkable. There's no enmity toward gays or notable political activism. One post says he's signing a petition to legalize marijuana.

The page's most recent public post, from June 3, shows a photo comparing an Adolf Hitler quote to one from Hillary Clinton. An anti-Clinton, pro-Bernie Sanders photo was posted in February. The site said Howell worked as an auditor for a company that makes air filters. Howell was charged in October in Clark County, Indiana, with pointing a firearm at someone, and with intimidation. He made a deal with prosecutors in April to plead guilty only to the misdemeanor

intimidation charge. He was given one-year prison sentence that the judge suspended in favor of strict probation that prohibited him from having weapons. A friend of Howell's, 18-yearold Joseph Greeson, said Howell's parents in Jeffersonville hadn't seen him for days and that they called Greeson's parents looking for him. Greeson told the Los Angeles Times that he and Howell are in a car club together and that Howell had a gun collection.—AP

TRUMP ASSERTS THOUSANDS IN US ARE 'SICK WITH HATE' 'MUSLIMS LIVING HERE KNOW WHO THEY ARE

WASHINGTON: Republican Donald Trump asserted yesterday there are thousands of people living in the United States "sick with hate" and capable of carrying out the sort of massacre that killed at least 50 people in a Florida nightclub. "We can't let people in. ... We have to be very, very strong," the presumptive Republican presidential nominee said in one of a host of broadcast interviews he undertook in advance of a speech he planned later yesterday in New Hampshire. "The problem is we have thousands of people right now in our country. You have people that were born in this country" who are susceptible to becoming "radicalized," the billionaire real estate mogul told Fox News Channel's "Fox & Friends. He claimed that there are Muslims living here who "know who they

Trump, who got embroiled in controversy early in the presidential sweepstakes when he advocated a ban on Muslims being admitted to the United States, said "there are people out there with worse intentions" than the perpetrator of the shootings in Orlando early Sunday. "They have to report these people," he said.

are" and said it was time to "turn them in."

Muslim ban

Trump planned later yesterday to further address the deadliest shooting in modern US history in a campaign speech originally intended to attack Hillary Clinton, the presumptive Democratic nominee. That switch came a day after Trump called for Clinton to drop out of the race for president if she didn't use the words "radical Islam" to describe the Florida nightclub massacre.

Trump will retool his talk in New Hampshire to "further address this terrorist attack, immigration and national security," his campaign said Sunday. A gunman wielding an assault-style rifle and handgun opened fire inside a crowded gay nightclub in Orlando early Sunday, killing at least 50 people before dying in a gunfight with police. Another 53 people were hospitalized, most in critical condition. Authorities identified the shooter as Omar Mateen, a 29-year-old US citizen from Fort Pierce, Florida.

Trump's hardline approach to fighting Islamic terrorism was a hallmark of his primary campaign. Besides proposing a temporary prohibition on foreign Muslims from entering the country, he has and advocated using waterboarding and other harsh interrogation methods to try to stave off future attacks.

In the hours after the Orlando shooting, Trump issued a statement calling on President Barack Obama to resign for refusing "to even say the words 'radical Islam" in his response to the attack. He said Clinton should exit the presidential race if she does the same.

In an address from the White House, Obama called the tragedy an act of terror and hate. He did not talk about religious extremists. He said the FBI would investigate the shootings in the gay nightclub as terrorism, but added the gunman's motivations were unclear. Yesterday he said "we're led by a man that either is not tough, not smart, or he's got something else in mind. People cannot believe that President Obama is acting the way he is and cannot even mention

paign. Instead, she said the country must "redouble our efforts" to defend the country, including "defeating international terror groups, working with allies and partners to go after them wherever they are, countering their attempts to recruit people here and everywhere, and hard-

UN RIGHTS CHIEF SLAMS GROWING MIGRANT DETENTION IN EUROPE

GENEVA: The UN's human rights chief voiced alarm yesterday at the increasing detention of migrants in Europe, including unaccompanied children, amid widespread anti-migrant rhetoric across the continent. As Europe faces its biggest migration crisis since the aftermath of World War II, UN rights chief Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein said he had sent staff members to assess areas along the main migration routes in the central Mediterranean and Balkans.

"They have observed a worrying increase in detention of migrants in Europe, including in the hotspots, (which are) essentially vast mandatory confinement areas which have been set up in Greece and Italy," he told the opening of the UN Human Rights Council's second annual session. "Even unaccompanied children are frequently placed in prison cells or centers ringed with barbed-wire," he said, insisting "detention is never in the best interests of the child."

Zeid urged the EU to collect data on migrant detentions by member states, warning that "the figures would, I fear, be very shocking." More than one million people made the iourney to Europe in 2015, the majority fleeing war in Syria and the Middle East, and a further 208,000 have come since January, according to UN figures.

More than 2,850 people have died trying to cross the Mediterranean so far this year. Faced with the influx, the UN rights chief warned that in many countries were showing "a strong trend that overturns international commitments, refuses basic humanity, and slams doors in the face of human beings in need."

He pointed out that EU countries so far have managed to relocate fewer than one percent of the 160,000 people they have committed to taking from overwhelmed Greece and Italy. He urged European countries to "find a way to address the current migration crisis consistently and in a manner that respects the rights of the people concerned," and to "remove hysteria and panic from the equation."

This, he said, was particularly important in the context of a controversial deal between the European Union (EU) and Turkey in March, under which migrants not entitled to asylum are to be deported from Greece back across the Aegean. Zeid also decried "the widespread anti-migrant rhetoric that we have heard, spanning the length and breadth of the European continent." "This fosters a climate of divisiveness, xenophobia and even, as in Bulgaria, vigilante violence," he said.

Before they reach Europe, many migrants are meanwhile suffering horrible human rights abuses in chaos-wracked Libva, the UN rights warned. He decried "disturbing reports of many migrants in Libya being subjected to prolonged arbitrary detention, attacks and unlawful killings, torture and other ill-treatment, sexual violence and abduction for ransom." UN staff visiting a migrant detention centre in the country found "dozens of people crammed into storage rooms without space to lie down." He urged EU countries attempting to cooperate with Libya on migration and border management to only do so "in full respect for the human rights of the people involved." — AFP

5 ARRESTED FOR TRAINING CHILD TO PRETEND HE WAS PRESIDENT'S SON

LA PAZ: Bolivia has arrested five people for allegedly coaching a boy to pretend he was President Evo Morales' son, and paying his family, in a soap opera-style scandal that has riveted the country, officials said Saturday. "The boy was told his entire education would be paid for, that he would be given a plot of land, in addition to as much as \$15,000 to the boy's parents," top prosecutor Ramiro Guerrero told reporters.

The detained suspects were not immediately identified. But they are close to Gabriela Zapata, a former girlfriend of the single president, with whom he had a son who died in 2009, Guerrero said. They were charged with conspiracy, people trafficking and blocking the execution of government obligations. Morales, Bolivia's first indigenous president, acknowledged he had a child with Zapata, but said the boy died soon after birth. Zapata had insisted he was

alive before recently changing her story.

A former manager at Chinese engineering group CAMC, Zapata, 28, has been accused of using her ties to the president to land \$560 million in government contracts for the company. The case exploded onto the political scene just as Bolivia prepared to hold a referendum on whether to change the constitution to allow Morales, 56, to run for a fourth term. Morales, who has been in office since 2006, went on to lose the February 21 vote. He underwent courtordered DNA testing in April to resolve the paternity case. But Zapata refused to present the child for testing, saying the state medical officials in charge could fake the results. Amid the scandal, Congress opened an investigation after the government admitted Zapata used state offices and employees to carry out CAMC business, but ruled Morales was not at fault. —AFP

PAKISTANI CLERICS DECLARE 'HONOR KILLING' UN-ISLAMIC

LAHORE: A group of Pakistani clerics has issued a fatwa, or religious ruling, declaring "honor killing" over perceived damage to a family's reputation against the teaching of Islam, and anyone who carries out such an attack a heretic.

Hundreds of Pakistanis, the vast majority women and girls, are murdered every year by relatives after being accused of damaging a family's honor. Most cases involve young women trying to choose partners against a family's wishes. The ruling by the Sunni Ittehad Council, which includes more than 100 prominent clerics, comes after a string of particularly shocking killings including the burning to death by a mother of a 16 year-old girl who eloped with a young man. "It seems we are moving towards an age of barbarism," the council said in its fatwa issued on Sunday, a rare edict on the problem in the Muslim majority country of 190 million people. "Burning women alive for marrying by their choice is against the teachings of

The council is affiliated with the Barelvi sect of Sunni Islam, the largest sect in Pakistan, and it holds significant influence in Punjab province, where half of Pakistanis live. "Considering any killing in the name of honor to be justified is heresy," the council said in a press release. Last Friday, a father in the eastern city of Lahore, the capital of Punjab, killed his daughter and her husband because he disapproved of their mar-

Last month, a 16-year-old girl accused of helping a young couple elope was killed and her body set on fire, in a case that again brought into the national spotlight. Last year, more than 500 men and women were murdered in such, according to the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan. The toll this year, as of yesterday, was 233, the group said.

Most suspects in honor killings are never prosecuted. The religious council called on the government to amend laws that allow family members to "forgive" perpetrators in killings over honor, which means charges are often dropped. In February, Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif praised an Oscar-winning Pakistani film on honor killings, raising hope among activists that long-pending legislation on the issue would be passed. However, no progress has been made. —Reuters

BANGLADESH ANTI-MILITANT ARRESTS NOW MORE THAN 8K

GOVT ACCUSED OF SUPPRESSING POLITICAL DISSENT

DHAKA: Bangladesh police claims of responsibility by the Ahmed told AFP. said yesterday they have arrested more than 8,000 people in a nationwide crackdown launched after a wave of murders targeting minorities and secular activists. Authorities have come under mounting international pressure to end the attacks in which nearly 50 people have been killed over the last three years, many hacked to death with machetes.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina vowed at the weekend to catch "each and every killer" and yesterday police spokesman Kamrul Ahsan said 3,245 suspects had been arrested, raising the total to 8,192 since Friday. Opposition parties have accused the government of using the crackdown to suppress political dissent.

Deputy inspector general of national police AKM Shahidur Rahman said most of those arrested were criminal suspects with existing warrants against them, rather than suspected militants. "Only a fraction of the people who have been arrested are members of Islamist militant groups," he said. The crackdown comes after five suspected Islamist militants were shot dead in gunbattles with police in recent days.


It is thought to have been triggered by the murder this month of Mahmuda Begum, wife of a top anti-terror police officer. The officer had led several high-profile operations against the banned group Jamayetul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB), members of which were among those arrested in the latest sweep.

JMB is one of two local groups blamed by the government for most of the recent killings. Authorities reject Islamic State (IS) group and a South Asian branch of Al-Qaeda and say they have no presence in the country. SOLDIERS CLASH AT KHYBER PASS BORDER: OFFICIALS

clashed overnight at the main border crossing at the end of the Khyber Pass, officials said yesterday, with at least one killed and several wounded, further straining relations between the militancy-plagued neighbors. One Afghan soldier was killed and six were wounded, an Afghan official said. The Pakistani army said one of its soldiers was wounded in the fighting at the Torkham Gate crossing in the mountainous region of northwestern Pakistan and eastern Afghanistan.

Both countries blamed each other for starting the fighting, which broke out at roughly 9 p.m. local time on Sunday and continued into the night. "We currently have agreed on a ceasefire with #Pakistan. We hope this problem will end through the work by diplomatic addresses," the Afghan government's chief executive, Abdullah Abdullah, said on Twitter. "The current fight Pakistan started doesn't help anyone's interest."

Relations between the neighbours have been strained in recent months. Kabul has accused Pakistan of harbouring militants seeking to topple the Afghan government, including the notorious Haggani network, blamed for high-profile attacks in the capital. Pakistan denies support-

Ayub Hussainkhil, border police commander in eastern Afghanistan, said the fighting at the Torkham Gate stopped at 5 am on yesterday.

"We have received reinforcement and are ready to defend our country until the last drop of blood in our bodies," he said. The Pakistan-Afghanistan border has long remained porous and disputed. Afghanistan has blocked repeated attempts by Pakistan to build a fence on sections of the roughly 2,200-km long frontier, rejecting the contours of the boundary. Last month, Pakistan build a border post between Pakistan's South Waziristan and . Afghanistan's Paktika province and handed it over to Afghan officials. Hours later, Afghan authorities shut the post, saying that the actual border lay about a kilometer inside Pakistani territory. —Reuters

THAI KING IMPROVING AFTER **HEART OPERATION: PALACE** BANGKOK: Thailand's ailing King along political lines. Anxiety over impossible because of the world's

Bhumibol Adulyadej is recovering well after a recent operation to improve blood flow to his heart, the palace said, the latest in a series of major medical procedures for the 88-year-old. Bhumibol is the object of an intense personality cult and his frail health is a matter of significant public concern.

On Tuesday doctors performed a series of angioplasty procedures without anaesthetic, using balloons and stents to widen multiple arteries in his heart. In the latest update on his health released by the palace late Sunday, doctors said the king was making progress with blood pressure and breathing back to normal.

An electrocardiogram also showed improved bloodflow to the heart, the statement added. The king is confined to a wheelchair and rarely seen in public. He has spent most of the past two years hospitalised in Bangkok for a series of ailments, including bacterial infections, breathing difficulties and hydrocephalus (water on the brain).

Bhumibol is the world's longestreigning monarch and most Thais have never known life under another king. He is largely seen as a unifying force in a nation bitterly divided

what will happen after his reign ends is considered an aggravating factor in the country's past decade of tumultuous politics, as competing elites jostle for power and influence before the transition. Information on the monarchy is tightly controlled by the palace. Throughout much of the last two years of Bhumibol's hospitalisation, updates have been rare. But in recent weeks the palace has issued a string of health announcements.

Last month doctors announced that he had been successfully treated for hydrocephalus as well as a lung and knee infection. Bhumibol has not been seen by the public since September when the palace released a video of him being taken in his wheelchair to visit a shop inside Bangkok's Siriraj hospital. Shoppers and attendants knelt and bowed as he passed by.

An official photograph of him attending a ceremony was released by the palace in December, while officials also released a statement in January saying he briefly left his hospital for an hour-long trip by car to visit a palace and other royal projects. Discussion of his reign and the role of the monarchy is all but strictest lese majeste laws.

Pilot jokes about crashing PM plane

Meanwhile, Thai budget airline carrier Nok Air apologized yesterday after one of its pilots joked about crashing a plane carrying ousted premier Yingluck Shinawatra. The gaffe highlights how hatred towards the Shinawatra political clan still runs deep two years after Yingluck's administration was toppled by a military coup.

The pilot's comments were made in a social media chat group used by Nok Air pilots that was later leaked. In it a pilot posted a picture of Yingluck about to board their Nok Air flight over the weekend. One chat member responded with "We have prey on board". Another then added "CFIT".

CFIT is an aviation acronym for "controlled flight into terrain", a term used to describe when a pilot unintentionally crashes a plane that has no technical problems. Panthongtae Shinawatra-the son of Yingluck's brother Thaksin Shinawatra, who was toppled as premier by a 2006 coup-posted the leaked chat on his Facebook. —Agencies

RAID ON FRAIL INDONESIAN FOOD SELLER SPARKS ANGER

JAKARTA: Indonesian netizens have reacted with fury and a flurry of donations after footage emerged of a frail food seller breaking down as her cafe was raided for staying open during the daytime in Ramadan. Video of the 53year-old business owner desperately begging officials not to confiscate her food went viral at the weekend, and social media users have donated almost \$20,000 to a crowdfunding site to help her and other vendors.

It is common for food outlets in the world's most populous Muslim-majority country that remain open during the daytime in the holy month of Ramadan, when Muslims are supposed to fast from sunrise to sunset, to be raided. But the case of food seller Saeni, who like many Indonesians goes by one name, has touched a nerve, with many criticizing authorities for being heavy-handed during the raid in Serang, west of the capital Jakarta. "You should be tolerant towards

those who are not fasting, cruel authorities," wrote Facebook user Elisabeth Oktofani. The food seller was deeply in debt and so had decided to keep the cafe open during daylight hours to make extra cash, she was quoted by local media as saying. President Joko Widodo condemned the raid and ordered his staff to make a personal donation, with his spokesman saying that the action "cannot be justified".

In the footage, a group of public

order officers, who assist police in maintaining order but have fewer powers, march into the small food outlet, which consisted of a few goods in a glass case and some shabby chairs and tables. Saeni, wearing a blue Muslim headscarf, begs them not to take the food but they put it into plastic bags and march off.

Local authorities defended the raid, saying that the food seller was breaking the law. While many restaurants in bigger cities stay open throughout

Ramadan, local bylaws in smaller places often forbid vendors to sell food during the daytime. A crowdfunding campaign launched in response to Friday's raid has raised over 265 million rupiah (\$19,900), with the organizers planning to distribute the money to Saeni and other food sellers targeted for staying open during daylight hours in Ramadan. Most Indonesians practice a moderate form of Islam, but the country is also home to a vocal, hardline fringe. — AFP

TALENT AGENTS HELD OVER WOMAN FORCED INTO PORN

TOKYO: Three Japanese talent agents who allegedly forced a woman to appear in more than 100 pornographic videos have been arrested, a police spokesman and local media said yesterday. The suspects, including a 49-year-old executive at Tokyobased agency Marks Japan, were arrested on suspicion of violating the country's worker dispatch law, said a spokesman with the Tokyo Metropolitan Police Department.

Police suspect the trio forced the woman to go to a pornographic video film location in 2013, the spokesman said without giving further details. The woman signed a contract as a model with the agency in 2009, Kyodo News Agency reported. She was forced to appear in more than 100 videos, Nippon Television

Network said. The talent agency pressed the victim to perform in adult videos by allegedly warning her that she had to pay penalties for breach of contract if she refused, Kyodo added. Pornography is widely available in Japan, but the dark side of the industry is seldom discussed openly and the rights of those who work in it even less so. The country's porn industry is worth up to 500 billion yen (\$4.7 billion) annually, victim advocates said earlier this year. The cited abuses including coercive or fraudulent signing of contracts-sometimes targeting minors. Human Rights Now, a Tokyobased campaign group, said the number of cases in which counseling was sought over similar alleged abuse rose to 59 in 2015 from 32 in 2014 — after just one case each in 2012 and 2013. — AFP

MALAYSIA SHUTS DOWN 1ST SHARIA-COMPLIANT AIRLINE

KUALA LUMPUR: Rayani Air, Malaysia's first Islamic-compliant airline, has been shut down, regulators said yesterday, months after it was suspended from flying for breaching aviation regulations. The carrier launched only in December with Muslim flight crew wearing the hijab while non-Muslim members were forbidden from wearing revealing clothing. In-flight meals were completely halal and alcohol consumption banned.

But after an "investigation into the administration and safety audit" of the airline, the Department of Aviation (DCA) said it has revoked Rayani's Air Operator Certificate. The DCA launched an inquiry into the airline in April following a string of criticisms from passengers and the government over delays and last-minute cancellations.

That month saw pilots of the carrier, which operates two Boeing 737-400s, also go on strike over unpaid wages, further damaging its image. DCA director-general Azharuddin Abdul Rahman said the government took the step to cease Rayani's operation because "safety and security of the aviation industry is of paramount importance". The decision comes two years after Malaysia faced twin aviation disasters. Malaysia Airlines flight MH17 was shot down in July 2014 over rebelheld eastern Ukraine in a missile strike, killing all 298 people on board. Australia is leading the search for Malaysia Airlines flight MH370 in the remote Indian Ocean, where the Beijing-bound plane is believed to have diverted when it disappeared on March 8, 2014 carrying 239 passengers and crew. —AFP

AUSTRALIA HOLDS VIGILS FOR GAY COMMUNITY AFTER US MASSACRE

SYDNEY: The Sydney Harbour Bridge was lit with the colors of the rainbow yesterday as hundreds of Australians gathered to stand in solidarity with the global gay community after the worst mass shooting in modern US history. As Sydney's Town Hall was bathed in pink light, a crowd gathered at Taylor Square for a somber, candlelit vigil for the 50 people shot dead at an Orlando nightclub on Sunday, and the scores left wounded.

"This could have happened anywhere," Paul Savage, one of those paying tribute, told AFP from the busy strip that hosts Sydney's annual gay pride Mardi Gras as those attending held hands and hugged. "He could easily have walked into a bar in Sydney even though the gun laws here are much more helpful."

Savage said the level of hatred displayed by the gunman was "just incomprehensible" and described the vigil as a "show of solidarity". Earlier Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull had said the shootings were not only an assault on the gay community but "an attack on all of us" as Sydney's Lord Mayor Clover Moore tweeted "our hearts break for Orlando".

In Newtown, in Sydney's inner west, hundreds more gathered for a second impromptu vigil to call out discrimination and racism, adding that not only had the gay community been targeted but also Latinos. "We called this action because it desperately needed to be called," organizer Rachel Evans told AFP. "It's very important to come and say 'together we are strong."

Fight for rights

Organizers called on Australians not to lash out against Muslim communities, adding that the focus should be on continuing the fight for gay rights. In Melbourne, hundreds more gathered to pay their respects to those killed, while the government said buildings such as the Arts Centre would be lit in rainbow colors.

Australian rights activists said the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and intersex community had taken the attack deeply to heart. "When you go to a venue like a gay club you expect that to be one of the places where you feel safe and supported," Chris Pycroft from the New South Wales Gay and Lesbian Rights Lobby told the Australian Broadcasting Corporation.

In Wellington, the city council said New Zealand capital's main downtown concert venue, the Michael Fowler Centre, would be illuminated in rainbow colors, with a candlelight vigil nearby to remember the victims. Vigil organizers InsideOUT said all were welcome, adding: "We intend for this to be a space free of Islamophobia, please help us to

keep it that way." Prime Minister John Key said it was "a terrible and tragic day for America and the gay community". In Bangkok, around a dozen people held a candle light vigil outside Washington's sprawling embassy in, lighting candles and laying flowers and cards. One note on rainbow colored paper read: "Love always wins."—AFP

A WORLD OF OPINIONS ON SOUTH CHINA SEA CASE

Where countries stand on increasingly murky scenario

WASHINGTON: A case brought by US ally the Philippines against China represents a diplomatic dilemma for far-flung nations as Washington and Beijing rally support for their respective positions on the use of international arbitration in South China Sea disputes.

The United States has been building diplomatic pressure in the West and in Asia on China to abide by the Hague-based tribunal's decision, which is expected soon. China, which maintains it won't be bound by the ruling, has been pushing back by building support from nations mostly in Africa and the Mideast.

The US is not a party to the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea, under which the tribunal has been constituted, but says it wants China to play by international rules. Since there is no enforcement mechanism for the ruling, any impact will depend on how the international community reacts. Here's a look at where dozens of countries stand:

Association of Southeast Asian Nations

ASEAN has been trying for years to achieve diplomatic solutions in the South China Sea, making little progress and exposing divisions in the 10-member bloc, which includes the Philippines. Reaching consensus on the Permanent Court of Arbitration ruling will be tough. When President Barack Obama met ASEAN leaders in February they agreed on "full respect for legal and diplomatic processes" in accordance with the UN convention, but pro-China members Cambodia and Laos nixed any mention of "arbitration." Vietnam, which has fought China over competing South China Sea claims, has been most supportive of the Philippines' case and submitted a statement to the tribunal. Hanoi has said it supports "full compliance" to the procedures of the convention.

But other ASEAN nations are generally wary of speaking out for fear of alienating China, the region's economic heavyweight. Malaysia and Brunei have said little about the case, though they too are South China Sea claimants. Indonesia and Singapore are not claimants but have been a bit more outspoken. Singapore's Foreign Minister Vivian Balakrishnan said last week that the ruling could have implications beyond the South China Sea and "we cannot subscribe to the principle that might is right." Indonesia's Foreign Ministry declined to say whether the ruling should be binding on both sides but said international law must be respected. Even the Philippines' position is unpredictable as a new government takes office there June 30. President-elect Rodrigo Duterte has expressed willingness to restart bilateral negotiations with China.

Russia

Moscow, which shares China's suspicion of Washington, is Beijing's most prominent supporter on the issue. On a visit to China in April, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said Russia is against any interference from outside parties in the South China Sea - a reference to the US - "or any attempts to internationalize these disputes." Like China, Russia says disputes should be resolved through talks between the parties directly involved.

Africa and Mideast

China's state news agency Xinhua on May 20 said that more than 40 countries have expressed support for China's stance on the arbitration case. The Foreign Ministry has in recent weeks given prominent mention to support it claims to have from nations principally in Africa, the Mideast and Central Asia. But few of those foreign governments have issued statements inde-

pendently. Some, including Cambodia, Laos and Fiji, have disavowed China's description of their position. Experts at the Center for Strategic and International Studies in Washington said they could confirm official statements from Afghanistan, Gambia, Niger, Sudan and Vanuatu. A Chinese statement with the 21-member Arab League supported China but it was unclear if it represented all the parties' official positions.

Australia

the China-Philippines ruling will be "extremely important" as a statement of international principle and will "settle once and for all" whether artificial reefs are entitled to territorial waters. But Australia has been less outspoken in support of arbitration than the US, perhaps mindful of Australia's own resistance to arbitration to resolve its disputed maritime border with tiny East Timor.

India

India has not issued a categorical position on arbitration case, but has been broadly supportive of the application of international law. India shares U.S. concerns about Beijing's rising ambitions in the seas of Asia. India's External Affairs Ministry says that "all countries must abide by international law and norms on maritime issues." India set an example in 2014 when it accepted a decision by the Hague-based Permanent Court of Arbitration that ruled in favor of Bangladesh in a dispute over the countries' maritime boundary.

Japan

Japan was an early supporter of the In January, Foreign Minister Julie Bishop said Philippines' pursuit of arbitration and says both China and the Philippines should abide by the outcome. Japan sees that as upholding international law, but it also reflects concern that historic rival China seeks strategic control of vital sea lanes in the South China Sea that carry 80 percent of Japan's crude oil imports.

> Japan's support of third-party dispute resolution is not universal. While it has sought to take its dispute with South Korea over the South Korean-held Dokdo or Takeshima islands to the International Court of Justice, it says no such action is needed in its dispute with China over the Senkaku or Diaoyu islands, which are administered by Japan.—AP

CHINA AIRPORT BOMBER WAS GAMBLER WITH HEAVY DEBTS

SHANGHAI: Chinese police yesterday identified the suspect in a bombing at Shanghai's main international airport which injured four people as a 29-year-old man with heavy debts from online gambling.

Zhou Xingbai had been working at an electronics company in Kunshan city near Shanghai but had lost his savings through gambling and was having difficulty supporting himself, the Shanghai police department said in a statement on its official microblog. Zhou told his friends through social media that he "owed many people money" and was "preparing to do something extremely crazy" and "losing his little life was a certainty", the statement said.

A previous government statement said Zhou threw a beer bottle packed with explosives near a check-in counter in Terminal Two at Pudong International Airport on Sunday afternoon. He then took out a knife and slashed at his own neck before being admitted to hospital in critical condition. Police said he used gunpowder from fireworks in his homemade explosive device, residue of which was found in his rented room in Kunshan.

"A beer bottle with a burning fuse rolled into the queue when we were waiting for check-in," passenger Susan Shen was quoted as saying by the Shanghai Daily newspaper. "And then suddenly the bottle exploded with a loud bang and colourful flash like fireworks." Zhou, originally from the southwestern province of Guizhou, had a high-school education and worked at various jobs before arriving in Kunshan in 2014, police said.

There have been several cases in China of disgruntled individuals setting off explosions or starting fires in revenge for perceived wrongs. In 2013 a wheelchair-bound man detonated a homemade bomb at Beijing international airport as a protest at alleged police brutality. The man, Ji Zhongxing, was later sentenced to six years in jail. Last year an unemployed man set off an explosion at a public park in the eastern province of Shandong, killing himself and another person and wounding 24. —AFP

HUMAN RIGHTS ACTIVIST REARRESTED IN BAHRAIN

DUBAI: Bahraini security forces vesterday rearrested leading human rights activist Nabeel Rajab in a dawn raid in the Gulf kingdom, his family said on Twitter. Rajab, 51, who was detained in 2014 for tweets deemed insulting to the authorities before his release on health grounds, was apprehended at his home in the village of Bani Jamra near Manama, his family said.

"Rajab was arrested from his house and his house was searched," tweeted his wife Sumaya Rajab. There was no immediate clarification on the reason for his latest arrest. Rajab, who has led anti-government marches and heads the Bahrain Centre for Human Rights, had previously served two years in jail for taking part in unauthorized protests.

He was sentenced to six months in jail for his tweets but pardoned in July 2015 after **Nabeel Rajab** King Hamad issued a royal pardon "for health reasons". Bahrain, home to the US Navy's Fifth Fleet, has

The Gulf Centre for Human Rights has said Khawaja was jailed for three years and one month on charges including tearing up the monarch's picture and insulting a police officer.

Jail terms upheld

Also yesterday, an appeals court in Bahrain upheld jail terms of between 10 and 15 years for 11 people convicted of forming a "terrorist group" that planned to attack police and the Saudi embassy in Manama among other charges, a judicial source said. It also confirmed a previous criminal court order to

revoke their citizenship, the source added. Rights groups say Bahrain has detained scores of opponents of the kingdom's Saudi-allied rulers, often sentencing them to lengthy jail terms. A court in May more than doubled the jail sentence passed against opposition leader Sheikh Ali Salman, who is now set to serve nine years for inciting violence. — AFP

MICROSOFT ACQUIRES LINKEDIN FOR \$26BN said it would finance the deal mostly by issuing new debt.

Clever, or too late?

Benedict Evans, a member of the Andreessen Horowitz venture capital firm who blogs on technology, said in a tweet that deal appear to be future-looking. "Very clever and oblique MSFT thinking-how will we communicate, share & connect in a decade? Not docs + email. Social graph is key," Evans said in a Tweeted referencing the company's Wall Street trading symbol.

But Roger Kay, analyst and consultant with Endpoint Technologies Associates, said it was doubtful that Microsoft can use the deal to compete in the world of social networking dominated by Facebook. "It doesn't help at all competing with Facebook," Kay told AFP.

"LinkedIn is not in the same league as Facebook." Kay said Microsoft, paying a premium of some 50 percent for LinkedIn, is likely to end up writing down much of the investment. "It seems extraordinarily expensive," he said. "I'm going to make the prediction they will write this down. There is no way they can extract \$26 billion from LinkedIn."— AFP

US PROBES GUNMAN'S MOTIVE AFTER MASSACRE

The relatives of the dead and wounded-clubgoers celebrating at one of Orlando's most prominent gay venues at the start of Gay Pride month-were informed early yesterday that police had identified 48 of the 49

Another 53 were wounded, but city mayor Buddy Dyer said many more were saved by police action, including when they crashed an armored car through a wall to allow patrons to escape as the gunman barricaded himself in a bathroom with hostages.

"We will not be defined by the act of a cowardly hater. We will be defined by how we respond, how we treat each other," Dyer declared, before police recounted how a gunbattle at the entrance to the club became a bloody hostage drama. As the club was closing at around 2:00 am, Mateen began a gun battle with an offduty officer working at the club. More officers responded to the scene, and the gunman fell back to the bathroom, where he apparently seized hostages.

"At that time, we were able to save dozens and dozens of people," Orlando police chief John Mina told reporters. Witness Janiel Gonzalez described scenes of mayhem as the gunman sprayed revelers with bullets.

"It was like complete chaos," witness Janiel Gonzalez told AFP. "It was like a scene out of a movie. People were screaming 'Help me, help me, I'm trapped!" Mina said he later made the difficult decision to burst into the club after Mateen made comments about "bomb vests, about explosives."

"We believed that further loss of life was imminent," Mina told reporters at a morning press conference.

"We knew that was the right thing to do and believe we prevented a future loss of life and saved many, many lives." Police used explosives and a BearCat armored car to punch a hole in the wall of the club. Dozens more survivors surged out of the breach, but Mateen opened fire and was cut down by police.

Officials in Orlando, a resort city famous worldwide as the home of Walt Disney World and other amusement parks, were stunned by the tragedy but vowed that the community would pull together.

'Not a war zone'

"This is not a war zone that we are living in. This is a civilized society and we had to deal with something unthinkable," Orange County Sheriff Jerry Demings said. The attacks triggered solidarity vigils by gay and lesbian groups-and their supporters-across the country and abroad. More than 100,000 marched in Los Angeles at an already planned Pride parade.

In New York, the Tony Awards for musical theater went ahead as planned but were dedicated to the victims of the massacre. The Empire State building went dark, while the spire of One World Trade Center was lit in the rainbow colors of the gay pride flag.

But no mood of national outrage could survive long in the crucible of America's 2016 presidential race, and presumptive Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump seized upon it to launch an attack on Obama and his Democratic rival Hillary Clinton. "I think you're going to see tremendous pressure now on these weak politicians that don't know what they're doing, like our president," Trump said in an interview with Fox News.

"The man has no clue. He doesn't know what he's doing and Hillary Clinton is going to be worse than him," he declared, arguing that Obama had failed to confront the threat of "radical Islam" because of "political correctness."

Trump accuses Obama of seeking to bring hundreds of thousands of Syrian migrants to the United States. In reality, the White House's goal this year is to offer sanctuary to only 10,000 of the most vulnerable war refugees.

Clinton pushed back against the charge that she is unwilling to identify Islamist extremism as a threat, telling MSNBC: "We have to defeat radical jihadist terrorism or radical Islamism, whatever you call it. It's the same. "But we cannot demonize, demagogue and declare war on an entire religion... it plays into the hands of ISIS and other jihadist terrorists. And so that's why I have been focused on how we tackle this issue of

illicit sex and 40 lashes for drinking alcohol. Hasan, who was also not present in court, will undergo a medical examination to see if he is fit enough to withstand his punishment. He will not serve any time in jail but will also be deported from the Gulf state once he has been punished. Dutch ambassador to Qatar Yvette Burghgraef-van Eechoud, who was present in the packed courtroom, told reporters that the embassy would help Laura to leave Qatar.

"We will do everything to get her out of the country as soon as possible to where she wants to go," Eechoud said. The envoy added that she expected Laura to leave Qatar, which will host the football World Cup in 2022, within the next few days.

The ambassador added that she had spoken to Laura on Sunday and said that "under the circumstances she was doing fine". In the Netherlands, Laura's mother said she had not yet spoken to her daughter but was "so happy" at the news of her release.

'So happy'

"I do not know yet when she gets home, but this is not most important," she told the Dutch television NOS website. "The most important is that she gets home... I am so happy," she said.

Laura was arrested on March 14 and has since been held in custody. Her lawyer previously said that the incident happened after she had visited a Doha hotel. "She went dancing but when she returned to the table after the first sip of her drink, she realized that" she had been drugged, Brian Lokollo has said.

"She really didn't feel very well," he added. The young woman remembers nothing more until the following morning when she woke up in a totally unfamiliar apartment "and realized to her great horror, that she had been raped," Lokollo said.

The male defendant had insisted that their night together had been consensual and that the woman had even asked for money. Adultery, or illicit sex, is treated as a serious crime in the emirate. But the case provoked an international outcry with many people appalled by the treatment of an alleged rape victim and an online campaign using the #freelaura hashtag to try to draw attention to the Dutch woman's imprisonment.

Nicholas McGeehan, Gulf researcher at Human Rights Watch, said the case demonstrated that "proper procedures and investigation are needed to avoid such cases

Before the quarrels, the National Assembly agreed to extend until the next term an investigation launched by the public funds protection committee into allegations that many state-owned farms were illegally distributed to people who do not qualify.

Head of the committee MP Abdullah Al-Turaiji said that it has been found that some officials at the agricultural authority are partners in the allotted farms and called on Public Works Minister Ali Al-Omair to submit all required documents to the committee. MP Khalil Abdullah said that some officials who are summoned by the probe committee provide false information or refuse to provide facts citing secrecy laws.

Omair told the assembly that the government has provided all the necessary names and information to the committee and that they did not have anything to hide. But a number of MPs insisted that important information related to the probe has not been given by the government and some MPs claimed that certain names were not given to protect them.

When we suppress our material desires, we refine and enhance our spiritual experiences. Millions of people fall prey to the temptation of thousands of adverts that pop up everywhere to arouse hidden desires and tickle imagination. Therefore, we are more in need for fasting than ever before to withdraw from the pressure of this materialistic culture.

A part of the problem is that it seems that there is nothing wrong with excessive consumption as long as we are buying useful things that are permissible (Halal) for Muslims. It is not forbidden for a Muslim to lead a comfortable and happy life and enjoy all the worldly pleasures to the fullest. The crucial point here is to differentiate between looking at these pleasures as means or ends in themselves. Some people are obsessed with getting more and are literally enslaved by materialistic culture, which is like a maze with no end. People entrap themselves in a vicious circle of endless whims.

As for the solution, we are not supposed to shun all material aspects of this life and deem them haram (prohibited), but we have to realize the difference between wanting something and needing something. Some practical tips might help us redress the balance. First,

we have to adopt a simple lifestyle based on our actual needs, not our capricious desires. Remember the similitude the prophet portrayed of the Muslim in this earthly life: 'Be in the world as if you were a stranger or a traveller along the path." Second, invest your surplus resources (time, money, strength) in learning, helping the poor, volunteering in charities, and worshipping. Third, teach others how to live a simple life away from the pressures of material culture.

Many are concerned that the aggressive consumerism will steal the true and pious purposes of the holy month. Ramadan invites us to experience real spiritual independence from physical needs through the practice of self-discipline and refraining from pleasure, solely for the love of God. This helps the fasting person to emerge as more powerful and become conscious of the suffering that millions of people undergo in our world today.

MASSACRE THRUSTS TERROR THREAT INTO WHITE HOUSE RACE

white House hopeful Donald Trump appeared bent on exploiting Sunday's massacre in Orlando to boost the argument that he can be trusted to tackle terrorism over rival Hillary Clinton. With many victims of the carnage yet to be identified, and police still probing the suspected Islamist ties of the slain gunman, Trump wasted no time in harnessing the assault to his political advantage.

The presumptive Republican nominee unleashed a broadside accusing President Barack Obama and his would-be Democratic successor Clinton of failing to tackle what Trump calls "radical Islam."

"Because our leaders are weak, I said this was going to happen-and it is only going to get worse," he said in a statement. "I am trying to save lives and prevent the next terrorist attack. We can't afford to be politically correct anymore."

Trump is set to deliver more of the same tough talk at a campaign appearance in Manchester, New Hampshire yesterday. The speech was originally to be about Clinton, but he is shifting the focus to national security.

His other yesterday event, in Portsmouth, was scrapped, his

campaign said. As the country reeled from what is being treated as the deadliest attack on US soil since September 11, 2001, Tim Malloy, assistant director of the Quinnipiac University poll, said the threat of terrorism was likely to dominate the US campaign debate.

"It will be at the forefront until election day," he said.

Waterboarding

After extremists slaughtered 130 people in Paris last November and a Muslim husband-and-wife team murdered 14 in San Bernardino, California, Trump called for a ban on Muslims entering the United States. The move prompted an uproar, but he doubled down, presenting himself as prepared to do more to crack down on extremism than his political rivals.

After San Bernardino, "It became a permanent part of the Trump dialogue," said Quinnipiac's Malloy. In March, following a deadly attack in Brussels, Trump said his insistence on defeating extremism was "probably why I'm number one in the polls."

Opinion polls late last year showed a majority of Republicans supporting Trump's call for a Muslim travel ban. Trump and Clinton are promoting radically different approaches to fighting terror, and have traded accusations that the other is not fit to run the country.

Trump has repeatedly called for a halt to refugee flows from the Middle East, and assailed Clinton for wanting to expand them. He says he is prepared to re-authorize torture methods such as waterboarding in terrorism cases and advocates targeting the families of terror suspects.

Trump also repeatedly argues that attacks like the one in Paris would have seen far fewer casualties if people had been armed to defend themselves. According to Quinnipiac, voters see Clinton as far more prepared than Trump to handle an international crisis-but they see Trump as better able to tackle the IS threat.

'Get out of this race'

Their rival styles were on display after a gunman unleashed an assault on a gay nightclub in Florida that left 50 people dead, reportedly after pledging allegiance to the Islamic State group. "If Hillary Clinton, after this attack, still cannot say the two words 'Radical Islam' she should get out of this race for the presidency," Trump thundered.

The former secretary of state trod more cautiously. She declared Sunday's attack "an act of terror" and an "act of hate," and issued a statement saying Washington should redouble efforts to counter terror threats at home and abroad.

Clinton was to visit Ohio yesterday for her first rally since clinching the Democratic nomination. She is expected to address the Orlando tragedy then. Obama was to join her Wednesday for a high-profile campaign appearance, but the event was postponed because of the shooting.


'Strongman'

Clinton leads Trump in most head-to-head matchups, but "things can happen in the final weeks and months before the election," explained Norman Ornstein of the American Enterprise Institute.

"What if we have an attack like Paris in October?" he asked. "Maybe people will say we can't trust a person who's never had any experience. But maybe there is the allure of a strongman."

Clinton argues that her experience-as first lady, US senator and top diplomat-makes her the most qualified to be president. She has reminded voters she urged Obama to authorize the mission to kill Osama bin Laden. But Trump touted his own clairvoyance about national security challenges, tweeting the "congrats" he received "for being right on radical Islamic terrorism."—AFP

TRUMP AND CLINTON CONTRASTS IN ORLANDO RESPONSE

or Donald Trump, Sunday's mass shooting in Florida was a moment to redouble his call for tougher action against terrorism and to take credit for "being right" about the threat. For Hillary Clinton, it was a time to choose words carefully and reiterate her call for keeping "weapons of war" off America's streets. The responses of Trump and Clinton to the deadliest mass shooting in modern US history were a study in contrasts for the two presumptive presidential nominees one of whom will soon be leading a country fearful of terrorism, gun violence and the often merciless intersec-

The motive behind Sunday's early morning rampage at a gay nightclub in Orlando was unknown when Trump and Clinton began weighing in. By day's end, authorities still had far to go in uncovering what led Omar Mateen, a 29-year-old American citizen from Florida, to open fire, kill 50 people and critically wound dozens more.

As information began trickling out, Trump took to Twitter to say he was "praying" for the victims and their families. "When will we get tough, smart & vigilant?" he wrote. Within a few hours, the presumptive Republican nominee was back on social media saying that he'd appreciated "the congrats for being right on radical Islamic terrorism." After President Barack Obama did not use that same phrase to describe Mateen in his remarks from the White House, Trump released a statement saying the president "should step down" - a provocative response that far exceeds the typical Republican criticism of Obama's approach to extrem-

Trump is hardly the first politician to try to capitalize on a tragedy, though

he's more blatant than most in connecting his electoral prospects to incidents of unimaginable suffering. Shortly after last year's deadly attacks in Paris, Trump said, "Whenever there's a tragedy, everything goes up, my numbers go way up because we have no strength in this country. We have weak, sad politicians."

Clinton, who is more schooled in the political customs of responding to tragedies from her years as a senator and secretary of state, was careful in her initial comments. The presumptive Democratic nominee also made her first remarks on Twitter early Sunday, writing: "As we wait for more

information, my thoughts are with those affected by this horrific act." Like Obama, Clinton prefers to avoid early missteps even if that leaves her looking overly cautious. On Sunday, she waited for the president to declare the shooting an "act of terror" before doing the same.

Clinton and Obama postponed plans to campaign together Wednesday in Wisconsin, a decision driven both by political appearances and an expectation the president would need to spend his week overseeing the government's response to the shooting. Still, Clinton planned to continue with solo campaign stops Monday in Ohio and Tuesday in Pennsylvania. Clinton didn't avoid the prospect of a link to international terrorism in her statement, though she was vague in her language. She has made stricter gun control legislation a centerpiece of her presidential campaign and was more direct in raising the shooting as an example of the nation's failure to keep guns "out of the hands of terrorists or other violent criminals." Federal authorities said later Sunday that Mateen purchased at least two firearms legally within the last week or so.

Whether the tragedy in Orlando ultimately sways the trajectory of the general election campaign is unknown. If current trends hold, there will be more deadly mass shootings in the US before voters head to the polls in November. Other unforeseen events will likely also shape the race over the next five months, as the 2008 economic collapse did in the closing weeks of that year's presidential campaign. But as voters begin seriously weighing Clinton and Trump as their next commander in chief, Sunday's shooting left little doubt that the choice between the two candidates is stark. —AP

DISPLACED ZIMBABWE VILLAGERS AWAIT GOVT ACTION

illagers relocated to a sprawling governmentowned farm complex in eastern Zimbabwe to make way for the nation's biggest diamond field are hoping that President Robert Mugabe's move to take control of the valued resource will benefit them. More than 1,000 families were moved in 2009 from a village adjacent to the Chiadzwa diamond field in Marange to Arda Transau, a 12,000 hectare farm settlement about 40 km (25 miles) to the north with promises of a better life.

Arda Transau was billed as a new township with tarred roads, shops and health clinics - but seven years later the villagers say they have yet to see the promised education and health facilities while their homes are crumbling and food is scarce. Seven mining companies licensed to mine the area were ordered in March to leave by Mugabe who accused them of robbing Zimbabwe of wealth. Mugabe took over all diamond operations in the newly-formed Zimbabwe Consolidation Diamond Company (ZCDC).

Some of the affected diamond companies - Mbada Diamonds and Anjin Investments - have since taken the government to court with the issue still pending before the courts. While Mugabe's move could further tarnish the country's image as a risky investment, with investors already unnerved by his drive to force foreign-owned firms to sell majority shares to locals, the relocated villagers are hoping it will help them.

Caiphas Mujuru is one of the Arda Transau residents lobbying the government to get ZCDC to address the problems faced by the villagers who are facing severe

food shortages. "Life is really difficult here at Arda Transau. We are going hungry," Mujuru told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "We had been promised honey and milk here but it is now a nightmare for us."

DROUGHT AND HUNGER

When the villagers were moved, each family was given \$1,000 in compensation and a four-room house but these new dwellings, painted bright yellow, have since developed cracks. Families were promised 11 hectares of arable land including one hectare earmarked for irrigation to run small piggery or poultry projects but this never happened, the villagers say.

People in Marange hoped the diamond industry would pump money into reviving failing irrigation schemes as small-scale farmers cannot maintain or replace ageing equipment and national law requires mining companies to help local communities develop. But the plight of the villagers has been further exacerbated by the current El Nino induced drought which has decimated the southern African nation's crops, leaving 4 million Zimbabweans in a population of 14 million without adequate food supplies.

The villagers had the chance to voice their concerns at the Alternative Mining Indaba conference in Mutare this month comprising civic society, communities and stakeholders in the mining sector and legislators promised to help. "We will take your concerns to the Minister of Mines (Walter Chidhakwa)," Prosper Mutseyami, legislator for Musikavanhu constituency in Chipinge district, told the villagers.

However the diamond companies maintain they fulfilled what they were expected to do for the relocated villagers. Anjin Investments, which was a joint venture between the government and Chinese investors, said it complied with the law when it came to the relocation of the villagers.

"We did everything required by the law," Anjin Investments' Chief Executive Officer Munyaradzi Machacha told the Thomson Reuters Foundation in a telephone interview. A spokesman for Mbada Diamonds, George Manyaya, said his company was happy with what they had done for the villagers and the traditional leaders had appreciated their initiatives.

But villager Blessing Mufute said the situation at Arda Transau had become so bad that many people were going hungry. "We have been selling the few livestock we had to buy food," said Mufute, adding relocated villagers were in urgent need of jobs, clean water, and electricity as well as food. In a telephone interview with the Thomson Reuters Foundation, Mines Minister Walter Chidhakwa said local people should not feel they are forgotten. He said the Manicaland Provincial Affairs Minister Mandi Chimene would work with the Ministry of Labor and Social Welfare to provide social and food assistance to the villagers. Contractors would also be asked to work on the poorly built houses at Arda

Transau, Chidhakwa added.

But James Mupfumi, who heads the Centre for Research and Development, a local non-governmental investigative organization, is skeptical. "It is disheartening to realise that the Mines Minister has already visited Arda Transau for Zimbabwe Consolidated Diamond Company to relocate more villagers to Arda Transau without addressing previous community grievances," he said. —Reuters

STEYN REPLACES INJURED SPRINGBOK LAMBIE

JOHANNESBURG: South Africa called up experienced fly-half Morne Steyn yesterday to replace injured Patrick Lambie for the second Test against Ireland this weekend. Steyn, who plays for French Top 14 club Stade Français, is in South Africa as the season has ended for the Paris-based club. Renowned for his goal kicking, the 31-year-old has scored 694 points in 60 Tests since debuting seven years ago

against the British and Irish Lions. He is expected to start on the bench Saturday in a must-win second Test for the Springboks following a shock 26-20 loss in Cape Town last weekend. A win for Ireland at Ellis Park would clinch the three-Test series and turn the final international in Port Elizabeth on June 25 into a 'dead rubber'. Elton Jantjies, who replaced concussed Lambie in Cape Town last Saturday, is set to start as South Africa seek revenge after suffering a first home defeat by the Irish. Ireland flanker CJ Stander, whose aerial collision with Lambie injured the playmaker, was red-carded following the incident. — AFP

PALACE RELEASE ADEBAYOR. CHAMAKH AND HANGELAND

LONDON: Crystal Palace have decided against handing new deals to strikers Emmanuel Adebayor and Marouane Chamakh and defender Brede Hangeland, the Premier League club said on its website (www.cpfc.co.uk) yesterday. Adebayor joined Palace on a short-term deal in January but netted just once in his 15 appearances for the club. Chamakh too failed to nail down a starting spot during his two years at Selhurst Park and was not help by injuries, which restricted the Morocco international to just 66 appearances. Hangeland, who featured just 26 times over the course of the last two seasons, will be joined by fellow defender Adrian Mariappa in leaving the club. The London club also decided to cut ties with long-serving defender Paddy McCarthy, who made 151 appearances since arriving back in 2008. Staying for another season, however, are goalkeeper Julian Speroni and defender Damien Delaney who both signed one-year contract extensions. — Reuters

SIMPSON HOPES TEAM MATE VARDY STAYS AT LEICESTER

LEICESTER: Leicester City defender Danny Simpson is hopeful that striker Jamie Vardy

will reject the overtures of Arsenal and still be at the Premier League champions when the new season kicks off. Arsenal have triggered a release clause in Vardy's contract with a bid believed to be 20 million pounds (28.43 million) for the England striker, with the player yet to commit to the move, according to British media. "I have spoken to Jamie," Simpson told the BBC. "Everyone wants him to stay. We would like everyone to stay, even if it's just for one more year. "It's his decision and he says he wants to concentrate on the European Championship." Vardy, 29, was the joint second-highest scorer in the Premier League last season with 24 goals and is currently on international duty at the Euro 2016 tournament in France. 'BROKEN' PISTORIUS SHOULD NOT BE JAILED, COURT HEARS

PRETORIA: Oscar Pistorius is a "broken" man who should be hospitalised rather than jailed, a South African court heard yesterday, as the Paralympic athlete awaits sentencing for the murder of his girlfriend three years ago.

The double-amputee killed Reeva Steenkamp, a model and law graduate, in the early hours of Valentine's Day in 2013, saying he mistook her for an intruder when he fired four times through the door of his bedroom toilet.

Red-eyed, tearful and sometimes resting his head in his hands, the 29-year-old "Blade Runner" attended the first day of his sentencing hearing at the High Court in Pretoria along with members of his family, "He has developed a serious psychiatric condition which has become worse in the past two years," psychologist Jonathan Scholtz, called by the defence,

told the court. "Further imprisonment would have a detrimental effect on him." Scholtz said that during recent interviews Pistorius had displayed signs of "post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety disorder and depressive disorder". "Currently he is not able to testify (to the court). His condition is severe," he said. In March, Pistorius's lawyers failed in their legal bid to reverse a Supreme Court of Appeal judgement that upgraded his original conviction from culpable homicide-the equivalent of manslaughter-to murder.

The original trial judge Thokozile Masipa is expected to pass a new sentence after hearing arguments from both prosecution and defence. Scholtz added that Pistorius "has almost given up, his spirit seems broken" and he should be

sent to hospital. "(He is) a vulnerable, anxious man. extremely uncertain of himself without his prostheses." Pistorius faces a minimum 15year jail term for murder, but his sentence could be reduced due to time already spent in prison and mitigating factors, including his disability.

Steenkamp's parents were both in court on Monday, and her father Barry may take the witness stand to ask the court to impose a lengthy punishment.

If he does, it will be the first time that one of Steenkamp's parents has testified in the case.

TV INTERVIEW CRITICISED

Pistorius has shunned the media during years of intense coverage since Steenkamp's killing, but his family have revealed that he has given his first interview, due to air on British broadcaster ITV later this month. The interview drew a

sharp attack from state prosecutor Gerrie Nel, who said it proved that Pistorius was capable of testifying. "He would rather give his version to the TV than to court," said Nel, who accused psychologist Scholtz of being biased. Pistorius was released from jail last October to live under house arrest at his uncle's mansion in Pretoria after serving one year of his five-year sentence for culpable homicide.

Since being convicted of murder, Pistorius has been on bail and allowed to leave his uncle's house at set times, but not travel further than 20 kilometres (12

miles) without permission. The hearing-held in the same courtroom as the original trial-was adjourned until Tuesday. It is scheduled to last one week. Pistorius has always denied killing Steenkamp in a rage and, during his dramatic seven-month trial in 2014, sobbed

in the dock as details of his lover's death were examined in excruciating detail.

The year before he killed Steenkamp, Pistorius became the first doubleamputee to race at Olympic level when he

appeared at the London 2012 games. He has since lost his glittering sports career, lucrative contracts and status as a global role model for the disabled.

"(Pistorius) is adamant that he never wants to touch or handle a firearm again," said Scholtz yesterday. "He becomes traumatised when he hears the sound of gunfire, even when it is part of a film he is watching." Other exchanges on Monday revealed that while in prison Pistorius caught an infection in his leg stumps after being forced to shower on a concrete floor. About 20 Pistorius supporters rallied outside the court, saying he should be treated leniently. — AFP

Warriors star Draymond Green suspended for Game 5

OAKLAND: Through all of the criticism and and threw another jab at the four-time MVP accusations of dirty play, Draymond Green vowed to keep pushing as hard as he possibly could to help deliver another championship to Golden State.

That win-at-all-costs mentality has suddenly opened the door for LeBron James and the Cleveland Cavaliers to get back into the NBA Finals, and added an extra edge to a burgeoning rivalry.

Green was suspended for Game 5 last night after the league assessed a Flagrant 1 foul for striking James in the groin during a scuffle in the closing minutes of the Warrior's Game 4 victory Friday night.

James and Green got tangled up on the play, and James stepped over Green as the two got up - a move widely viewed as a show of disrespect in league circles. Green then swiped at James' groin in retaliation that did not connect. "There's no way you can say this is an acceptable act," Kiki VanDeWeghe, the NBA's executive vice president of basketball operations, told The Associated Press in a phone interview. Especially for a player like Green, who entered the finals one flagrant foul or two technicals short of a mandated suspension.

"History probably didn't help Draymond," Warriors center Andrew Bogut said. "When they reviewed it, that's probably what helped them get to their decision." Commissioner Adam Silver put the hardnosed, emotional leader of the defending champion on notice before the start of the rematch with Cleveland when he said that the Competition Committee would in the offseason be reviewing Green's penchant for wildly flailing his legs on jump shots

and rebounds. Green was given a Flagrant on the other end of the court. 2 foul and fined \$25,000 for kicking Oklahoma City's Steven Adams in the groin during the Western Conference finals and picked up a Flagrant 1 for throwing Rockets forward Michael Beasley to the ground in the first round. Green also kicked Cavs quard Kyrie Irving in the chest - inadvertently, Green said - in Game 1 of the finals, which was not penalized by the league.

"You have to do what you think is right for the play," VanDeWeghe said, "and unfortunately Draymond put himself in this position." Golden State leads the series 3-1 and has easily been the better team. But losing a player of Green's caliber could tip the scales just enough.

Green is a plus-71 in the last two NBA Finals, serving as the heartbeat of the Warriors defense and a critical playmaker

Warriors coach Steve Kerr spoke to Green earlier in the postseason about keeping his emotions in check, but they again got the better of him at a crucial time. "Draymond's success is based on playing like that," Bogut said. "He plays physical and chippy and he's a talker. That's what makes him who he is. It's hard to tone that down when it's in you. We don't blame him for it."

The after-the-fact technical levied against James isn't unprecedented. It's the fourth assessed by the NBA in the last two postseasons. Last year in the Chicago-Cleveland East semifinals, the Cavs' Matthew Dellavedova got one. This year, Oklahoma City's Kevin Durant (in the Thunder-Dallas series) and Miami's Goran Dragic (in the Heat-Toronto series) also were assessed technicals after league review.

"There's no rhyme or reason to it," Bogut said. "I've been in the same situation. I've been suspended before. I think it's like a lottery decision, like the draft. They just pull out a ping-pong ball and make a decision."

James said Green crossed the line with some of the trash talk he hurled toward the Cavaliers star, and said he felt Green's swipe at his groin was "a little outside of basketball." Green's teammates stood tall for him, saying James instigated the confrontation when he stepped over Green on the court. "You don't let anybody walk over you," Bogut said. "If someone walks over me, I'm getting up the same way." "I was just trying to get back into the play," James said. The incident has helped turn what started out as a respectful rivalry between two of the best teams in the league into a heated contest. — AP

Ventura hits career-high 10 AS ROYALS BEAT WHITE SOX 3-1

CHICAGO: Yordano Ventura struck out a season-high 10 batters in seven innings, and the Kansas City Royals held on for a 3-1 win over the Chicago White Sox on Sunday afternoon. Whit Merrifield finished 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run to lead the Royals at the plate. Salvador Perez added a solo home run as Kansas City won its second consecutive game. Ventura (5-4) fanned 10-plus batters for the fifth time in his career and the first time since Oct. 3, 2015, against the Minnesota Twins. He struck out the side in the second inning and again in the sixth inning. A pending nine-game suspension did little to distract Ventura, who is appealing the penalty for his role in a June 7 brawl with the Baltimore Orioles. Ventura allowed one run on five hits and walked one.

CUBS 13, BRAVES 2

The Chicago Cubs were a comedy of errors defensively with Bill Murray on hand for the final two games against Atlanta. The Cubs won both in laughers anyway, making the actorcomedian happy and improving the team's major-league-best record to 43-18. Jon Lester (8-3) didn't allow an earned run over seven innings and the Cubs made four errors in the first two innings against the Braves on Sunday. The Cubs had three errors in Saturday's game. Anthony Rizzo had three hits and three RBIs, while Javier Baez blasted a three-run homer as part of a six-run eighth inning that followed a three-run seventh by the Cubs.

TIGERS 4, YANKEES 1

Michael Fulmer continued his impressive run when he pitched six effective innings and won his fifth straight start as Detroit defeated New York. Fulmer (7-1) ran his scoreless streak to 28 1/3 innings by holding the Yankees to two hits. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it is just shy of the Detroit rookie record set by John Hiller, who had 28 2/3 scoreless innings Aug. 10-29, 1967. The right-hander also has allowed one earned run in his last 34 1/3 innings, giving him an earned run average of 0.26 in his last five starts and lowering his overall earned run average from 6.52 to 2.52. He only allowed a leadoff single to Aaron Hicks and a bloop double to Austin Romine that started the fifth.

BLUE JAYS 10, ORIOLES 9

Russell Martin hit a three-run homer, Kevin Pillar had a homer and two RBIs, Devon Travis had two RBIs and Toronto held on to defeat Baltimore. The Blue Jays won the final three games of the four-game series after the Orioles took the opener. Adam Jones hit two home runs and Pedro Alvarez, Chris Davis and Matt Wieters each homered once for the Orioles, who fell behind by six runs before cutting the lead to one.

CANADA'S HENDERSON WINS Women's PGA Championship

SAMMAMISH: Brooke Henderson beat topranked Lydia Ko with a birdie on the first hole of a playoff Sunday in the KPMG Women's PGA Championship after overcoming a three-shot deficit on the back nine.

The 18-year-old Canadian, ranked No. 4 in the world, closed with a bogey-free 6-under 65 - the best round of the week at Sahalee - to match Ko at 6-under 278. Ko finished with a 67. In the playoff on the par-4 18th, Henderson hit her second shot from 155 yards to 3 feet, while Ko's second from farther back in the fairway left her with 20 feet. Ko missed to the left, and Henderson tapped in to cap a week that started with a hole-in-one on her fourth hole of the tournament and ended with a major championship.

In regulation, Henderson saved par on 18 with a 12-footer, moments before Ko missed a 4-foot birdie try on the par-3 17th. Henderson also made a long eagle putt on the par-5 11th and birdied the par-3 13th. She won last year in Portland, Oregon, for her first tour title.

Henderson became the second-youngest winner in a major championship, with Ko the youngest last year in the Evian Championship in France. Henderson also ended the 19-yearold Ko's bid for her third straight major victory.

Ariya Jutanugarn, in search of a fourth straight victory, shot a 66 to finish a stroke back. The 20-year Thai player missed a birdie putt on the 18th that could have put her into the playoff.

FEDEX ST. JUDE CLASSIC

Daniel Berger won the FedEx St. Jude Classic for his first PGA Tour title, shooting a 3under 67 to hold off Phil Mickelson, Steve Stricker and Brooks Koepka by three strokes. The 23-year-old Floridian had had never been in a final pairing until Sunday. When Mickelson, with his 42 career PGA Tour titles, closed within a stroke, Berger birdied three of his next four holes, highlighted by a 32-foot putt on the par-3 14th that pushed his lead to 13 under. Berger finished at 13-under 267. He became the 13th first-time winner on tour this season and took home the winner's check of \$1.1 million in the 50th start of his career.

Mickelson and Stricker shot 67, and Koepka had a 66 in the round that was delayed three hours because of storms. Dustin Johnson had a 63, setting the back-nine record with a 29, to finish fifth at 9 under. Berger is the fourth firsttime winner at the event in the past six years and 10th overall in Memphis.

CONSTELLATION SENIOR PLAYERS CHAMPIONSHIP

Bernhard Langer won the Constellation Senior Players Championship for the third straight year, holing a 12-foot birdie putt on the final hole for a one-stroke victory at windy Philadelphia Cricket Club.

The 58-year-old German star won his seventh senior major title - his fifth in the last 11 majors - to tie Hale Irwin for second place on the career list, a victory behind Jack Nicklaus. Three strokes ahead at 2 under entering the round on the difficult Wissahickon Course, Langer closed with a 3-over 73 to finish at 1over 281 - the highest winning score in the history of the event first played in 1983. Mark O'Meara had the previous record at 7 under in 2010 at TPC Potomac in Maryland.

Langer held off Miguel Angel Jimenez and Joe Durant, saving bogey with a 6-footer on the par-4 17th and getting his birdie putt to drop on the par-4 18th after it caught the edge and circled the cup. Jimenez and Durant each shot 68 for the low rounds of the day.

Langer won in 2014 at Fox Chapel in Pittsburgh and last year at Belmont in Massachusetts. Langer has three victories this year, also winning the Chubb Classic in Florida in February and the major Regions Tradition last month in Alabama. The two-time Masters champion is third on the tour victory list with 28, one behind Lee Trevino. Irwin is the leader with 45. — AP

Penguins beat Sharks 3-1 for fourth Stanley Cup title

SAN JOSE: A turnaround season for the third title. The game ended when Crosby Pittsburgh Penguins ended with Sidney Crosby once again holding the Stanley Cup. Crosby set up Kris Letang's goahead goal midway through the second period and the Pittsburgh Penguins won the fourth Stanley Cup in franchise history by beating the San Jose Sharks 3-1 in Game 6 of the final Sunday night.

"It wasn't easy getting here, especially the way things started out," Crosby said. "The first half wasn't easy and I think everyone just stuck together, kept going and found some momentum there in March and continued to keep it going."

Brian Dumoulin opened the scoring with a power-play goal and Patric Hornqvist added a late empty-netter. Matt Murray made 18 saves to give the Penguins a championship seven years to the day after they beat Detroit for their

cleared the puck the length of the ice with San Jose on the power play, setting off a wild celebration. All that was left was for Crosby to accept the Conn Smythe trophy as playoff MVP and then the Stanley Cup.

"We tried to keep fighting and slowly started to turn things around," he said. "Everyone has a part in this. It feels really good to win your last game of the season." Three nights after squandering a chance to become the first Pittsburgh team to win a title in front of the home fans in 56 years, the Penguins finished the job on the road just like they did in Minnesota (1991), Chicago (1992) and Detroit (2009) in past title runs.

The championship in Detroit was supposed to be the first of many for a team led by players like Crosby and Evgeni

Malkin. But a series of concussions that led Crosby to miss almost entire season and a half, and a run of early playoff exits that included twice blowing 3-1 series leads prevented a second celebration in the Crosby era until now.

This didn't seem like it would be a season to remember back in early December when the Penguins were the near the bottom of the standings in the Eastern Conference and coach Mike Johnston was fired. But led by coach Mike Sullivan, the Penguins recovered to make the playoffs as the second place team in the Metropolitan Division. Pittsburgh knocked off the New York Rangers in the first round, Presidents' Trophy-winning Washington in round two and then rallied from a 3-2 series deficit to beat Tampa Bay in the Eastern Conference final. The Penguins were in control for

almost the entire Cup final.

They did not trail until Game 5 at home and responded to a strong push from San Jose in the clincher to avoid a decisive seventh game. Pittsburgh held San Jose to just one shot on goal in the first 19 minutes of the third period to preserve the one-goal lead. The Penguins sealed it when Crosby blocked a shot from Marc-Edouard Vlasic that set Hornqvist's empty-netter.

Pittsburgh owner Mario Lemieux pointed to general manager Jim Rutherford and a series of moves made during the season - including acquiring Phil Kessel from Toronto - as the reason the Penguins won it all.

"It's been an incredible year," Lemieux said. "We a rough start the first couple months of the season, then we made some changes. ... It's hard to win this Cup.

We're going to enjoy it for a while." Logan Couture scored the lone goal for the Sharks, whose first trip to the final in their 25-year history ended two wins short of a title. Martin Jones made 24 saves and was San Jose's best player for the series.

While the season ended in disappointment, it also was a bit of a breakthrough for Joe Thornton, Patrick Marleau and the rest of a franchise that had been known for playoff collapses, most notably in 2014 when the Sharks blew a 3-0 series lead in the first round to Los Angeles.

There was an electric atmosphere before the final home game of the season in San Jose with fans starting their "Let's Go Sharks!" chants well before the opening puck drop and an elaborate pregame light and video show firing up the fans. — AP

PERU GOAL KNOCKS BRAZIL OUT OF COPA

The Peruvian forward appeared to use his hand to score from close range with 16 minutes remaining and after a long delay while the referee consulted with his assistant while taking advice through an earpiece, he allowed the goal to stand. Television pictures showed Ruidiaz grinning after the goal had been awarded but the Brazilian players were apoplectic with rage at a decision that sent them tumbling out of the tournament before the knockout stages for the first time since 1987.

"We saw that the ball hit his hand but you can't complain," Brazil centre half Miranda told reporters. "(The referee) said he discussed it with four officials and that they didn't see the handball. "Brazil tried from the first minute to score but the ball didn't want to go in unfortunately, and that's football. If you don't score you pay for it."

The result lifted Peru to the top of Group B

and eliminated Brazil, who dropped down to third place behind Ecuador in the tournament being played in the United States to celebrate the centenary of governing body CONMEBOL and the Copa America.

Following the conclusion of the first two groups in the 16-team competition, Peru will play Colombia in the quarter-finals in New Jersey on Friday, while the host nation will take on Ecuador in Seattle a day earlier.

Mexico, Venezuela and Argentina have already qualified from the other two groups with a match to play with either Chile or Panama joining them in the quarter-finals pending the result of their showdown on Tuesday.

MISSED OPPORTUNITY

The loss was a harsh one for Brazil, who knew a draw would have been enough to see them advance and were generally the better team without ever really threatening the Peruvian goal. Peru upped the tempo after a lacklustre first half and the controversial decider came after 74 minutes when Andy Polo whipped in a low cross that fell just behind the onrushing Ruidiaz inside the six-yard box.

The Universitario player appeared to handle the ball into the net to the immediate anger of the Brazilian players, who surrounded the Uruguayan referee along with several Peruvians before the official opted to give the goal after a long delay. Elias then missed a golden opportunity to equalise for Brazil in injury time but he failed to connect properly with only the goalkeeper to beat. The result came just hours after Ecuador hammered a hapless Haiti 4-0 to guarantee their quarter-final berth.

Enner Valencia opened the scoring after 10 minutes and Jaime Ayovi doubled Ecuador's advantage nine minutes later after a swift counter-attack. Christian Noboa made it 3-0 with a well-placed shot after 56 minutes before Antonio Valencia tapped home the fourth after another break on 77 minutes.

The result left Haiti, who were competing in the competition for the first time, bottom of the group on no points and a goal difference of minus 11. — Reuters

MURRAY WARMS UP FOR QUEEN'S TITLE WITH BECKHAM'S SON

LONDON: Andy Murray warmed up for the start of his Queen's Club title defence with an unlikely practice partner as he took to the court with David Beckham's son Romeo.

Murray arrived at Queen's Club in west London over the weekend and the world number two found time to hit a few balls with Beckham's offspring before getting down to the serious business of preparation for the grass-court campaign.

Former Manchester United and England star Beckham is a friend of Murray's and has watched him play at Wimbledon on several occasions, so the Scot had no problem taking a break for a friendly session with 13-year-old Romeo. "I knew Andy was down here because I spoke to him earlier. But we were just coming down to see if there was any practice going on before the tournament starts. It was something that was a big plus for Romeo," Beckham said on the Aegon Championships podcast.

"Romeo's a member here now. So we came down to see a few of the guys practising and obviously it's great for him.

"He was playing against me this morning! So it's tougher now against Andy!" With Murray bidding for a record fifth Queen's Club crown this week ahead of the start of Wimbledon, the two-time Grand Slam winner, who has rehired Ivan Lendl as a member of his coaching staff, will be firmly in the spotlight over the next month.

ROLE MODEL

And Beckham believes there is no better role model for his tennis-mad son and any other youngster dreaming of a sporting career. "He (Romeo) retired at the old age of 13 from football and now he's happy hitting a ball around on the tennis court, he plays four or five times a week and he enjoys himself," Beckham said.

"When you look at role models, you want them to be passionate about the sport, passionate about what they do, to play hard all the time, and Andy's one of those players. "It's great for any young kid to have great role models in sport and Andy's definitely one of those for many kids around the world." — AFP

S LANKA LOSE SILVA AS RAIN SETS UP MARATHON FINALE

LONDON: Sri Lanka lost Kaushal Silva as rain set up a lengthy 47over final session on the fifth and last day of the third Test against England at Lord's yesterday. Only 22 balls were possible

between lunch and tea after rain washed out Monday's first session, with England 2-0 up in the three-match series. Sri Lanka resumed on 32 without loss in pursuit of a challenging victory total of 362.

Dimuth Karunaratne was 19 not out and Silva unbeaten on 12. In overcast conditions, staying at the crease against the England new-ball duo of Stuart Broad and James Anderson was going to be a tough task for Sri Lanka's opening pair, let alone reaching a target that would set a new record for the highest fourth-innings total to win a Test at Lord's, surpassing the West Indies' 344 for one against England in 1984. Monday's first over saw Silva edge Broad just short of England captain Alastair Cook at first slip.

But Anderson, England's alltime leading Test-wicket taker, struck in the fourth over when Silva (16), padding up after failing to pick an inswinger going against the Lord's slipe, was lbw.

Silva reviewed but to no avail, with Sri Lanka 45 for one. No sooner had Silva been dismissed than the umpires took the players off the field after just 18 minutes' left-hander play, with Karunaratne 27 not out.

England's first innings 416 was built around Yorkshire wicketkeeper Jonny Bairstow's Test-best 167 not out and 85 from Cook. Sri Lanka could only manage 288 in reply, despite fifties from Karunaratne and Silva, with allrounder Chris Woakes taking three for 31. England's second innings 233 for seven declared saw Alex Hales again fall short of a maiden Test century with 94 his third fifty of a series where the Nottinghamshire opener had twice been dismissed in the 80s. But there was controversy when Hales, then on 58, was bowled by Nuwan Pradeep on Sunday only to be spared by, as it turned out, an incorrectly called front-foot no-ball from Australian umpire Rod Tucker.

The Sri Lanka flag was draped over the tourists' dressing-room balcony for some 45 minutes in protest at Tucker's decision which, under current regulations, could not be overturned. — AFP

FOOTBALL FANS TRIED IN FRANCE, RUSSIAN HOOLIGANS 'EVADE ARREST'

MARSEILLE: Ten men will be tried in France yesterday over the violence between English and Russian football fans in Marseille, but prosecutors said 150 "extremely well-trained" Russian hooligans had evaded arrest.

England captain Wayne Rooney and manager Roy Hodgson made a public appeal to England fans to behave after UEFA threatened the team with disqualification. A Northern Ireland fan meanwhile became the first fatality at Euro 2016 after plunging over a guard rail into the sea to his death, police said. Six Britons, one Austrian and three French will be in court in the southern French city after Saturday's clashes, the worst violence at an international tournament since the 1998 World Cup. An England supporter who was seriously injured in pitched battles on Saturday remains in a "critical but stable" condition in hospital, prosecutor Brice Robin told a press conference.

The attackers have not been identified, but Robin said 150 "extremely well-trained" Russian troublemakers had taken part in the Marseille unrest. They were "prepared for hyper-fast and hyper-violent acts", Brice said and they slipped through police surveillance.

The head of Britain's Euro 2016 policing operation has said the Russians in Marseille were wearing gum shields, martial arts gloves and carrying knives. Assistant chief constable Mark Roberts told the Guardian newspaper that while "a small minority" of England fans were out to cause trouble at the match, there were hundreds of "Russian troublemakers". Tensions came to a head inside the Stade Velodrome after Saturday's 1-1 England-Russia draw.

Russian fans charged into a section of the stadium occupied by English supporters and began throwing punches, sending spectators including women and children fleeing.

MORE CLASHES FEARED

UEFA has warned Russia and England that they could be kicked out of the tournament if their supporters cause more violence. It also told the two countries to appeal to their supporters to behave.

In response, England's Rooney and Hodgson made a video plea for the country's fans to avoid further violence. "I'm appealing to you to stay out of trouble," Hodgson said. "We really desperately want to stay in the competition."

Rooney told fans: "Be safe, be sensible and continue with your great support for the players." The British government said it was "deeply concerned" by the Marseille violence and offered to send more police to France.

UEFA admitted there were stadium security flaws and

the fans were not properly segregated. They said changes would be made. The French cities of Lyon, which hosts its first match on Monday when Belgium face Italy, and Toulouse announced bans on alcohol sales to football fans on the days of Euro 2016 matches.

The French government has given regional police chiefs powers to ban alcohol sales and consumption from the day before matches near the 10 stadiums and fan zones being used for the month-long, 24-nation tournament.

The Northern Ireland who died became the first fatality at Euro 2016 after plunging to his death from a guard rail

overlooking the sea in the French city of Nice, police said. The young fan, who was in his twenties, fell about eight metres (25 feet) from a rampart on the Promenade des Anglais seafront at about 2.00am, police said.

The government said Sunday that 116 people had been arrested oveer football violence since the start of the tournament and 63 taken into custody.

Three people had been expelled from France and five others designated as a threat to public order and banned from entering the country, the interior ministry said. There were new incidents Sunday, as German football fans fought Ukrainian supporters ahead of their Group C game in Lille.

More than 50 known German hooligans were involved in the clashes, according to a German police source quoted by the SID sports news agency.

And in Paris about 50 French youths dressed in black taunted Croatian supporters, with the two sides throwing missiles and fireworks at each other before police moved in.

RED ALERT

There are concerns that Russian and English fans could clash again this week in the northern city of Lille. Russia's next game is in Lille on Wednesday against Slovakia, while England play Wales in nearby Lens on Thursday. Russian Sports Minister Vitaly Mutko said his country's fans "behaved improperly" and predicted UEFA would impose a fine this week. He laid the blame on match organisers for failing to separate supporters. — AFP

MINNOWS ICELAND OUT TO SHOCK RONALDO'S PORTUGAL

SAINT-TIENNE: Cristiano Ronaldo-led Portugal open their Euro 2016 campaign today eager to avoid slipping-up against minnows Iceland and aiming to emulate their run to the European Championship semi-

finals four years ago.

Portugal lost to eventual winners Spain on penalties in the semi-finals of Euro 2012 and have arrived in France determined to win Group F and book their

place in the knock-out stages.

First they must negotiate their way past surprise-package Iceland, who beat the Netherlands home and away in qualifying as the Dutch failed to reach Euro 2016. The tiny North Atlantic island nation of 330,000 people is making their debut at a major tournament and is the smallest country by population ever to feature at a European Championship.

Former Chelsea and Barcelona forward Eidur Gudjohnsen, 37, has come out of retirement to be part of the Icelandic squad.

Now plying his trade in Norway with Molde, the veteran said it will be a "dream come true" when Iceland face Portugal, who trounced Estonia 7-0 in a warm-up game last Wednesday.

Ronaldo netted twice before coming off at halftime and Iceland's Swedish co-manager Lars

Lagerback said his side must ensure a quiet night for

Real Madrid's superstar forward.

"I saw him play for 45 minutes against Estonia. I'm not sure he was really on holiday before but he recharged his batteries, both physically and mentally," said Lagerback.

"You can expect the best from him-but not against us." Portugal won their qualifying group by bouncing back from a shock 1-0 defeat to Albania in their opening game to win all of their remaining matches and top their group. Now winger Vierinha says the starstudded Portugal squad need to again show what they can do on the European stage.

"Everyone knows our objective is to win Euro 2016, but we have to go step by step," said Wolfsburg's Vierinha. "The players know what they have to do: beat Iceland, then Austria, then Hungary. We know our qualities and we have to show this on the pitch."

The 30-year-old says Portugal must justify their tag as group favourites. "We played very well in the build-up and we know that people consider us the favourites in the group, but we have to show that we are better than the other teams," he said. First up,

Portugal needs to subdue a resilient Iceland in Saint Etienne. The current team's rise is the result of an ambitious plan, which Iceland's football association (KSI) started 15 years ago, to build over 150 small artificial indoor arenas on the island.

It ensured football could be played without interruption through the long Icelandic winter and saw the junior side dubbed the 'indoor kids' in qualifying for the 2011 European U-21 finals.

The Icelandic team has a strong team spirit. "The main key is the mentality of the Iceland players," said FC Basel midfielder Birkir Bjarnason.

"We are hard working, we don't give up. "Many of us have been together for ten years, started together in the U-17s." Iceland warmed up for the Euro with a 4-0 trouncing of minnows Lichtenstein last Monday.

Real Sociedad striker Alfred Finnbogason is coming off the back of a successful loan spell at Augsburg where he scored seven goals in 14 German league games. And Iceland's captain and midfield general,

Cardiff City's Aron Gunnarsson, is raring to go.
"I've done some extra work, which was something I was lacking in our warm up games, but my form is in a good place and I'm just looking forward to the game," said the 27-year-old. — AFP

KANE MUST IMPROVE OR FACE BEING DROPPED: SHEARER

LONDON: Harry Kane's performance against Russia was not good enough and he could have no complaints if Jamie Vardy replaced him for England's Group B clash with Wales in Lens on Thursday, former England striker Alan Shearer said.

The Tottenham Hotspur striker, the Premier League's leading scorer last season, failed to shine in England's opening match and, according to Shearer, lacked energy. Leicester City's title-winning striker Vardy had to kick his heels on the bench in Marseille where England were held 1-1. "(England coach) Roy Hodgson would be within his rights to tell Harry Kane that his performance in Saturday's draw against Russia was not good enough and he has to improve or he will change things up frontand rightly so," Shearer told the BBC.

"I am a huge fan of Kane, and he has had another fantastic season for Tottenham, but he looked very leggy and tired against Russia on Saturday." Shearer still expects Kane to lead England's line against Wales, but says he needs to sten up.

"I would not alter anything about England's starting XI or the system they played in Marseille for their next game against Wales," he said. "I would tell Kane-and also Raheem Sterling, whose final ball was yet again very poor-that, although I am going to stick with you, if you do not do better then I will make those changes during the Wales game. It is up to them to respond."

Kane played as the central prong in a three-man attack against Russia with Adam Lallana impressive on the right and Sterling less so on the left despite plenty of the ball. Kane only touched the ball once in Russia's penalty area.

"Just because you have one bad game does not mean you are a bad player and Kane will be looking to Hodgson to give him another opportunity," Shearer said. "But Hodgson has a lot of other strong options, particularly in the centre-forward positions." Shearer said he had been impressed with England's midfield in which captain Wayne Rooney often dropped deep to allow Dele Alli the license to roam forward but still could have scored a couple of goals. "He played the new position very well and combined well with Eric Dier and Dele Alli too," Shearer said. "Dier sat in but Rooney and Alli had to decide when to stay and go forward-and they got it right." — Reuters

GERMANY SWOONS FOR COMEBACK KING SCHWEINSTEI

LYON: Both the German press and Germany's Euro 2016 squad poured praise on 'bloodied-fighter and come-back king' Bastian Schweinsteiger yesterday following his goalscoring heroics off the bench against Ukraine.

Despite having previous played just 245 minutes of football in 2016 due to a torn knee ligament in March, Germany's captain dismissed any doubts about his fitness with an electric goal. After Shkodran Mustafi's header gave Germany an early lead, Schweinsteiger scored his first international goal for nearly five years to seal a 2-0 win in their Group C opener on Sunday.

"This goal delights the whole of Germany!", wrote

German daily Bild as Joachim 'Jogi' Loew's world champions got off to a winning start. "Everyone enjoys his success and is pleased for him, especially Jogi's boys!"

Schweinsteiger scored in the 92nd minute with just his third touch of the ball having been on the pitch for just two minutes. The 31-year-old's brief cameo made German football history as his 14th appearance at European championships finals overtook Philipp Lahm's previous record.

The Manchester United star later admitted he was out of breath from his long sprint towards the German bench to celebrate the goal with his team-mates. "It's unbelievable, that something like that happened, you can only dream about it," he told reporters.

"I only had around 300 playing minutes under my belt this year, and then that happens... "I still haven't got the strength for 90 or 120 minutes. I'm okay for a half, but I feel really good." German fans are particularly delighted to have their skipper back after Schweinsteiger was left bloodied by a battling display in the 2014 World Cup final to help win the Brazil 2014 title.

"Bloodied fighter and comeback king! Why we're all behind 'Schweini' now," screamed the Bild headline.

There was also plenty of praise from his teammates. "It's super. Crazy. What a story! I'm delighted for him," said forward Thomas Mueller. Goalkeeper Manuel Neuer said he hopes Schweinsteiger can make a full return to the white

shirt soon. "I hope that he can play from the start as soon as possible and show what a class player he is," said Germany's stand-in captain. "Everyone knows his qualities, he brings order to our game." Loew was also delighted for his captain: "I think the goal gives Bastian personally, and all of us, a boost". This is not the first time Schweinsteiger has excelled in the comeback role at a major tournament.

He only made his first appearance four years ago in Brazil off the bench late in Germany's second group game, a 2-2 draw with Ghana, after an ankle injury hampered his World Cup preparations.

It remains to be seen whether the Man Utd star will start Germany's next crunch game against neighbours Poland at the Stade de France today.

But Germany's midfield general is back. "Too old! Too heavy! Too slow! You've exceeded yourself!," wrote his older brother Tobias Schweinsteiger, a former pro footballer and now Under-17 coach at Bayern Munich, on Twitter. "Never write B. Schweinsteiger off. Congratulations, brother." — AFP

MUSTAFI HELPS GERMANY TO NERVY WIN OVER UKRAINE

LILLE: Stand-in centre back Shkodran Mustafi headed his first goal for Germany and Bastian Schweinsteiger scored in stoppage time as the world champions survived several scares to beat Ukraine 2-0 in their opening Euro 2016 Group C match on Sunday.

Mustafi, who started in the absence of regular centre back Mats Hummels, rifled home a header after 19 minutes to give Germany the lead, which was not extended until Schweinsteiger, a 90th-minute substitute, swept home from close range. Germany, bidding for a fourth Euro triumph but first since 1996, dominated possession, but also relied on three top saves from keeper Manuel Neuer and a goal-line clearance by Jerome Boateng to come out on top.

Ukraine, playing in their second European championship, harried and hustled their opponents and their tight defence offered few clear sights of goal to the Germans. Yet lone striker Roman Zozulya was unable to offer much threat, except at the very start and in the closing stages as Ukraine pushed on in search of an

equaliser. In a breakneck first half, Ukraine's Yevhen Konoplyanka forced Germany keeper Neuer to make a flying save in the fourth minute before the Germans steadily took control, with Toni Kroos orchestrating most

It was from his free kick, that Mustafi, who last featured for Germany in March and only made the side because Hummels was recovering from a muscle injury, leapt behind Serhiy Sydorchuk to power in a header.

Ten minutes later Sami Khedira had the chance to double Germany's lead as Kroos floated a ball beyond the defence, but he shot straight at the keeper.

By then though, the Ukrainians had woken up and, driving their full backs higher up the pitch, forced Neuer to punch over a strong header from Yevhen Khacheridi. Boateng was then forced into a dramatic clearance, having first lost the ball before hacking it clear while backpedalling into the net. Lone striker Zozulya also had an effort disallowed for offside as Germany hung on until halftime. Ukraine posed less of a threat in the second half, relying on hopeful long balls forward, while their keeper Andriy Pyatov was forced into action to save a long-range effort from Khedira, a low drive from Thomas Mueller and from Mesut Ozil, when he was through on goal. Germany suffered one final fright when Mustafi headed back over Neuer's head, leaving the goalkeeper to scramble back towards his own net, while appearing to body check substitute striker Yevhen Seleznyov in the process. Then, in the final seconds, with Ukraine pushing up, Germany countered and Schweinsteiger slammed in an Ozil cross to score. The result extended Germany's unbeaten run against Ukraine to six matches and maintained their record of never having lost their opening match in a European Championship. Germany will play joint group leaders Poland at the Stade de France on Thursday, when Ukraine take on Northern Ireland in Lyon.

Several hours before the match, German and Ukrainian supporters scuffled briefly in the centre of Lille, though police quickly brought the situation under

BALE COMMENTS 'DISRESPECTFUL'

CHANTILLY: England manager Roy Hodgson has branded Gareth Bale "disrespectful" after the Wales star said his country showed more "passion and pride" than their neighbours and Euro 2016 rivals. England and Wales face off in Lens on Thursday, with Bale's team in the driving seat in Group B after they beat Slovakia 2-1 in their opening game and Hodgson's men could only draw 1-1 against Russia. Speaking before the Slovakia game, in which he netted a spectacular free-kick, Bale had said of England: "I think we've got a lot more passion and pride about us than them."

But in comments published by British media yesterday, Hodgson retorted: "Receiving disrespectful comments is part and parcel of being a footballer and a football coach. "I don't ever comment on other people. I've been in the game sufficiently long to know every opponent has got an opinion. "The other day it was (Russia goalkeeper Igor) Akinfeev saying we were the worst seeded team and now it's Gareth Bale.

"They can have those opinions, but I don't have any doubts personally about our patriotism or desire and that's the important thing. "If he believes that that's the case, he's welcome to that opinion. But we know who we are, we know what we are. We don't have any doubts about ourselves in that respect."

Defeat by Wales would leave England in a perilous position, but Hodgson has backed his players to bounce back from the blow of conceding a stoppagetime equaliser against Russia in Marseille.

"It is a tight dressing room, a passionate dressing room," said the England manager, whose side are based in Chantilly outside Paris. "I would recommend anybody who does have any doubts about players in that respect to watch the game and come to me afterwards and show me where they've seen that lack of passion and lack of patriotism because I certainly didn't see it.

"We'll get over it, no question of that. We'll bounce back. My hope is and my dream is that we'll play as well in the next two matches and go on to do well in the tournament." — AFP



SWEDEN FIGHTBACK HOLDS IRELAND AFTER HOOLAHAN BEAUTY

PARIS: Wes Hoolahan's brilliant finish was not enough to give the Republic of Ireland a winning start to Euro 2016 as Ciaran Clark's own goal ensured a 1-1 draw with Sweden

Hoolahan met Seamus Coleman's flighted ball with a controlled first-time strike three minutes into the second half at the Stade de France to give Ireland a lead they fully deserved. However, having been kept quiet for long spells by the Irish defence, Sweden captain Zlatan Ibrahimovic created the equaliser in the 71st minute when his cutback was turned into his own net by Aston Villa defender Clark.

efender Clark. It is a result that keeps both sides in the running in Group E, which also contains Italy and much-fancied Belgium, but the Irish will be especially frustrated at leaving with only a point.

Ibrahimovic was attempting to become the first player to score in four separate European Championships, but the Sweden captain was a peripheral figure in a first period in which Ireland were the better team.

Martin O'Neill's men played with far greater intensity and were first to threaten from a Jeff Hendrick shot nine minutes in that was well struck but was turned around the post by Andreas Isaksson.

Then Clark headed on a left-wing corner and veteran captain John O'Shea, stretching

at the far post, was just unable to turn the ball in with the goalkeeper beaten.

HENDRICK HITS BAR

Robbie Brady, an attacking player at club level but deployed as a left-back for Ireland, crashed a rising right-foot shot inches over, and in the 32nd minute Hendrick played a one-two with Shane Long before curling an effort from 25 yards onto the bar.

Meanwhile, former Paris Saint-Germain star Ibrahimovic was unable to trouble Irish goalkeeper Darren Randolph from a longrange free-kick.

Sweden were dealt a blow right on halftime when right-back Mikael Lustig came off with what appeared to be a groin injury.

Coach Erik Hamren was forced into a defensive reshuffle as substitute Erik Johansson came on in central defence and Victor Lindeloef moved out to the right.

That defence was finally breached three minutes into the second period. Coleman did superbly on the right and lifted the ball towards the far post where Hoolahan, all alone, smashed home a delightful first-time shot beyond Isaksson.

The sea of Irish fans behind the goal, bedecked in green, erupted, but having created almost nothing themselves, Sweden were nearly level barely a minute later.

nearly level barely a minute later. Clark turned a corner towards his own goal but Randolph made a superb save, diving low to his right to scoop the ball away.

Ibrahimovic finally came to life on the hour, firing just wide with his back to goal following a Martin Olsson centre. He had a new partner in attack by that point, with John Guidetti having replaced Marcus Berg in a switch which proved pivotal as Sweden dug

out the equaliser.

Guidetti's flick released Ibrahimovic, and his ball from the left was headed past Randolph by the unfortunate Clark.

Ibrahimovic then came within a whisker of converting a low driven cross by Olsson, but a point was the very least Ireland deserved as the match ended all square. — AFP

PIQUE'S LATE HEADER GIVES SPAIN WIN OVER CZECHS

TOULOUSE: Reigning champions Spain left it late but Gerard Pique's 87th-minute header earned them a deserved 1-0 victory over a dogged Czech Republic in their Euro 2016 Group D opener yesterday.

Pique headed in Andres Iniesta's "incredible" cross to give Czech goalkeeper Petr Cech no chance after he had made several fine saves to put his side within sight of an unlikely draw.

Cech reacted well to deny Alvaro Morata and David Silva in the first half while Czech defender Roman Hubnik deflected Morata's shot against his own post. Spain were given a fright when a stretching Hubnik forced a save from David de Gea and Cesc Fabregas made a goalline clearance to keep out Theodor Gebre Selassie's header.

But Pique's late intervention ensured the champions began with a victory to join Croatia on three points, a result which delighted King Felipe VI who congratulated the players after the match.

"We struggled a bit during the first half and we'd already had a lot of chances," Pique told journalists. "In the second half, we were lucky to score," he added, before paying tribute to his brilliant team mate with the observation: "Iniesta's pass was incredible." Czech Republic started

aggressively, but Cech was kept busy during the first half, setting the tone of the match with stops from Morata and Silva, who was making his 100th appearance.

Spain's rhythm improved as Czech intensity dipped, and while coach Pavel Vrba's ploy of employing two full backs on the right flank to deal with Jordi Alba was initially successful, the left back began to find space.

Both Alba and Silva forced stops from Cech, while Tomas Necid struck a shot at De Gea before half time.

"I think we played well," Pique continued. "We controlled the match but the ball just didn't want to go in." "We took the initiative throughout the match,"

added Spain coach Vicente del Bosque. "We dominated." The Czechs swapped their aggressive approach for more disciplined containment after the break, although Morata's cross forced Hubnik into a deflected error which beat Cech but bounced back off the post.

Vrba's side also served warning that they were capable of extending their opponents' miserable run of failing to win any of their opening tournament matches since 2008 with Hubnik and Gebre Selassie going close. Ladislav Krejci was on hand to make a superb last-ditch tackle on substitute Thiago Alcantara as a Czech defence that conceded 14 during the qualifiers kept Spain's wealth of attacking talent at bay.

Del Bosque introduced Aritz Aduriz for Morata, but it was an unlikely candidate, Pique, who ultimately secured the winning start for the champions. — Reuters

THIEM WINS STUTTGART

STUTTGART: Austrian Dominic Thiem won the ATP event in Stuttgart yesterday after rain caused the grasscourt final against German Philipp Kohlschreiber to be held over.

Kohlschreiber had been leading Thiem 3-2 in a first-set tiebreaker on Sunday when play was halted for the day. But the Austrian world number seven upped his game Monday, eventually running out a 6-7 (2/7), 6-4, 6-4 winner with the contest played on a side court in front of a small crowd of 1,000 due to water damage on the Centre Court grass.

"I've never been so relieved," said Thiem after claiming his fourth title of a breakthrough season. "This is by far my most special trophy. "Every title is wonderful, the only thing comparable would be winning Kitzbuehel at home," said the seventhranked Austrian.

"I came here almost expecting to lose in the first round. Then I reached the semifinals, the final and now the title. "I couldn't have expected this in my wildest dreams." Thiem, who moved into the ATP top 10 last week after a French Open semi-final performance, had already claimed titles in 2016 at Buenos Aires, Acapulco and Nice. The 22-year-old, who saved two match points as he knocked out Roger Federer in the semi-finals, was successful in his bid to become the first man this season to claim trophies on three different surfaces-clay, hardcourt and now grass.

"It's sad to lose the final, but I think it was a very good final," said Kohlschreiber, winner of five of his seven titles at German home events.

"It was a tough situation, because of the rain, but overall it was a great finish for

Worrying trend despite other signs of economic stabilization

BEIJING: Growth in China's fixed-asset investment slipped below 10 percent for the first time since 2000 in January-May as a boost from record credit growth seemed to be already fading, putting expectations of further stimulus back on the table. The government has taken a more cautious stance on stimulus since commentary in official media last month warned of the risks of growing debt, but analysts said signs of weakness in the latest monthly data may spur policymakers into taking additional steps to support the economy.

"I see rising odds of a cut in RRR (banks' reserve requirements) or even a policy rate cut, before the end of the second quarter," Zhou Hao, senior Asia emerging market economist at Commerzbank said in a note after May activity data yesterday. With the economy not yet on solid footing, other analysts agreed that more stimulus is likely in coming months. "The government will

likely launch more fiscal policies such as faster approval of infrastructure projects as downside risk to growth heightens," said Raymond Yeung of ANZ in a note.

A major worry for the authorities is the continued decline in fixed-asset investment by private companies. Overall fixedasset investment growth fell to 9.6 percent in January-May from a year earlier, missing market expectations of 10.5 percent, which would have been unchanged from Jan-April. Investment by private firms slowed to a record low, with growth cooling to 3.9 percent from 5.2 percent in Jan-April and double-digits last year. Private investment so far this year has been the slowest since China began publishing the data in 2012.

China needs to open up its state sector further in order to arrest the steep slowdown in private investment, statistics department spokesman Sheng Laiyun told

a news conference, adding that falling prices and industrial overcapacity have impacted private investment. Foreign direct investment in China, meanwhile, declined 1 percent year-on-year in May, the first decline since December, the commerce ministry said on Sunday.

Other data yesterday were more mixed, suggesting the economy may be bottoming out and less at risk of a hard landing but is still struggling to regain traction. Factory output grew 6 percent in May from a year earlier, the same as in April and marginally better than expected. Analysts believe industrial output has been supported by a government infrastructure spending spree and a further recovery in the property market.

Investment in real estate in May also posted its first year-on-year slowdown in growth since December, though property sales by area surged more than 32 percent.

Despite a jump in car sales, consumption softened slightly. Retail sales growth, which captures both private and government purchasing, slowed to 10.0 percent on-year. Analysts had forecast it would be unchanged from April at 10.1 percent.

Trade data last week showed a further drop in exports but the smallest decline in imports in more than a year, suggesting domestic demand was picking up. Consumer inflation cooled, but production price deflation eased markedly, reducing some of the strains on Chinese companies which are battling shrinking profit margins. Government pledges to cut excess industrial capacity and restructure bloated state-owned enterprises are a major wild card, posing risks to near-term growth and the financial system. But most economists expect Beijing to move slowly, fearing social instability if millions are suddenly thrown out of work. — Reuters

IRAQ SAYS IMF DEAL 'ON TRACK'

BAGHDAD: Iraq has approved measures requested by the International Monetary Fund in order to unlock loans that should help overcome a cash crunch caused by declining oil revenue, a senior government official has said. The agreement, reached last month between Iraq and the IMF, "is on track", Mudher Salih, an adviser on financial policy to Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi, told Reuters late on Sunday.

Among the measures approved are settling by the end of the year all arrears owed to foreign oil companies operating in Iraq, Salih said. He did not say how much was owed. The OPEC member has sought budget support to help it cope with a collapse in oil prices over the past two years. The drop in revenue that resulted caused the public deficit to widen and delayed payments to foreign oil producers.

The IMF in May agreed to provide \$5.4 billion over three years. But the funds are conditional on Iraq's implementing measures to cut spending, increasing non-oil revenue, and settling several billion dollars in arrears to oil companies. The Iraqi government approved the measures at a meeting last week and informed the IMF, Salih said in an interview. Baghdad expects the IMF board to approve by the end of June or early July the disbursement of a first tranche of about \$600 million, he added.

The reforms include a tax increase, higher electricity fees and better banking supervision to fight corruption and money launaudit the bloated public payroll to purge so-called "ghost employees" who do not show up to work. Global oil prices plunged just as Iraq needed more resources to fight Islamic State, the ultra-hardline group that seized vast tracts of the north and west, displacing about 4 million people.

Hopes for \$18 Billion

Salih said a recent increase in oil prices, to \$50 a barrel from below \$30 earlier this year, would not delay the reforms. The agreement with the IMF should unlock a total of \$18 billion in international assistance over three years, Finance Minister Hoshiyar Zebari has said. He cited the World Bank and the Group of Seven leading industrialised nations as donors, along

Zebari said Iraq expects to sell \$2 billion in eurobonds in the last quarter of this year, when international aid starts coming in, helping to lower its cost of borrowing. Iraq last sold international debt in 2006, when it issued about \$2.7 billion of bonds due in 2028 with a coupon of 5.8 percent. Iraq hopes that international support will bring the bond yields down to 5 or 6 percent, from about 10-11 percent now.

Iraq's existing bonds have been appreciating steadily since early May, when the understanding with the IMF was being worked on. The 2028 bond rose from below

about 75.75 cents, for a yield of around 10.5 percent. "We believe this is just a bit of profit-taking after the price had risen steadily since early May when the agreement in principle with the IMF was reached," said

dering, Salih said. There were also plans to streamline state-owned companies and cents on June 8. On Monday it traded at London. Oil prices and the IMF deal continue to be the main factors driving Iraqi bond prices, he said. Moody's and Fitch Ratings last month said Iraq's IMF deal was credit positive. Fitch rates Iraq's long-term credit at B-, below investment grade. — Reuters


SHARES IN G4S **PLUNGE AFTER US MASSACRE**

LONDON: Shares in British private security giant G4S plunged on the London stock market yesterday after it emerged that Omar Mateen, the gunman behind the massacre in a Florida gay nightclub, was one of its employees. The share price was down 5.71 percent at 176.70 pence at around 1000 GMT and the company published a statement on the London Stock Exchange website reiterating details about Mateen's employment.

"Mateen was subject to detailed company screening when he was recruited in 2007," the group said in a statement to the London Stock Exchange. Mateen was "re-screened in 2013 with no adverse findings. He was also subject to checks by a US law enforcement agency with no findings reported to G4S," the statement said. That followed an FBI statement on Sunday saying it had interviewed

Mateen three times

in 2013 and 2014. "G4S is deeply shocked by the tragic events in Orlando this weekend and the thoughts of everyone at G4S are with the victims and their families," the statement said, adding that he was employed by the company at a residential community in south Florida. "G4S is providing its full support to all law enforcement authorities in the USA as they con-

duct their investigations," the company said.

G4S employs 623,000 people worldwide and defines itself as "the largest security solutions provider in the world", according to the company website. Around 23 percent of its workforce is in Britain and Ireland and 20 percent in North America. In 2013, the group had a turnover of £7.4 billion (9 \$10.5 billion). US agents are investigating the alleged Islamist links of the 29-year-old gunman after an attack that left 50 dead - the worst mass shooting in modern US history. Carnage erupted at the Pulse club in Orlando in the early hours of Sunday before the attacker was shot dead by a police SWAT team. — AFP

OIL PRICES UNDER PRESSURE FROM RISING CONCERNS

LONDON: Oil prices fell yesterday even as OPEC forecast a further tightening of supplies, as traders focused instead on turbulence across financial markets. The Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries, whose 13 members together pump out about one-third of the world's crude, said yesterday that a global supply glut was likely to shrink further, leading to greater balance between supplies and demand of oil.

Around 1145 GMT, Brent North Sea crude for delivery in August was down 44 cents at \$50.10 a barrel. US benchmark West Texas Intermediate for July delivery fell 50 cents to \$48.57 a barrel compared with Friday's close. Crude prices had tumbled on Friday at the end of a volatile week, during which WTI struck an 11-month high, as a weaker dollar made the commodity cheaper for holders of non-US currencies.

"Oil prices have fallen because of various reasons, chief among them being a rallying US dollar and a sharp rise in risk aversion," Fawad Razaqzada, analyst at traders City Index, said yesterday. "This is evidenced, for example, by the slumping global stock markets, and rallying safehaven government bond prices, yen and gold. Investors are spooked about the prospects of a UK exit from the EU, the economic impact of a potential US rate rise in the summer, and renewed demand concerns out of China," he

World stock markets fell sharply yesterday on rising fears that Britain could vote to leave the European Union in next week's referendum and owing to uncertainty on the outlook for US interest rates. On oil markets, a combination of tighter supplies and a downbeat dollar sent oil prices surging to fresh 2016 high points last week, before they dropped on worries over the global economic outlook.

'Excess Likely to Ease'

OPEC yesterday said "the excess supply in the market is likely to ease over the coming quarters". In its June report, OPEC attributed the recovery to a myriad of factors, including a weaker dollar,

falling production in the US and forecasts of a sharp fall in non-OPEC oil supply this year, partly owing to disruptions in some producer countries. On Friday, data showed the number of active US rigs rose for the second week in a row, by three to 328, according to oilfield services firm Baker Hughes. However, that is still far below the 635 pumping a year

BMI Research analyst Peter Lee told AFP that companies were restarting rigs as prices above \$50 made it financially viable to pump crude again. "While the (upcoming) big events worldwide like the central bank meetings and (Britain's EU) vote will have an impact on the market, fundamentally, the picture still remains the same. It is all due to demand and supply," he added. Oil prices have rebounded from 13-year lows of around \$25 in January. The market previously dived from \$100 a barrel in mid-2014 because of the global supply glut.

Yesterday, the European Central Bank also said the fall in oil prices over the past two years would add less to global growth than earlier thought and the overall impact could even be negative. Oil traders have already sold out of long positions that have profited from an almost doubling in crude prices since hitting over decade lows earlier this year. "Oil may be looking healthier than it has in a very long time, but it is not yet out of the woods," Barclays said in a note. —Agencies

BREXIT FEAR FACTOR SENDS GLOBAL STOCKS SPINNING

One poll shows 10-point lead for 'Leave' camp

LONDON: Fears that Britain may be on the verge then there's also the Fed this week. Other polls have been tighter, but money markets have now abandoned expectations, high just weeks ago, that the US Federal Reserve could raise official borrowing costs on Wednesday, just 8 days before the UK vote. Instead, the worry is that the Fed could use language that quells expectations of a move this year at all.

More broadly, after eight years of ultra-low rates and outright money-printing, investors wonder if central banks have much ammunition left should the uncertainty that a Brexit would bring for thousands of businesses weaken demand and investment further. "We're in uncharted territory in front of the Brexit vote, and Choudhry, managing director at LONTRAD. "All the banks are a little bit lower, and they're the ones which are likely to get hit. For the next two weeks, you've got to be slightly mad if you've not got your money in defensive stocks."

The news out of China was also poor, with data showing fixed-asset investment slipped below 10 percent for the first time since 2000. Stock markets in Tokyo, Hong Kong and Shanghai all fell by around 3 percent. Moves in Europe, where investors have been preparing for the British vote for months, were only slightly more subdued. The Frankfurt and Paris stock exchanges both fell around 1.2 percent.

The index of major European bank shares fell 2 percent. It has been hammered this year by concerns that lenders will struggle as long as they are effectively paying central banks to deposit cash. Any new retreat in expectations for growth and inflation would only worsen that picture. In contrast, Britain's FTSE 100 fell just 0.4 percent, and both Deutsche Bank and JP Morgan said they remained overweight UK equities into the vote. "In the case of a 'Leave' vote in the UK referendum .. we expect UK equities to outperform the European market, given the likely GBP (British pound) depreciation in such a scenario as well as the market's defensive sector structure," Deutsche Bank strategists said in a note.

On currency markets, sterling fell almost 1 percent against the dollar after sinking by as much as 3 full cents in value on Friday. It was down by more, 1.2 percent, at 79.86 pence per euro. Options market pricing showed expectations for the biggest swings against the euro on record, and analysts at UBS raised the prospect of a cut in British interest rates and another round of quantitative easing if the economy struggles after the referendum. "If activity does slow further beyond the end of the second quarter, the market is likely to rapidly start considering how (the Bank of England) may choose to enact any further easing," economists from the Swiss group said in a note. The Bank of England meets on Thursday.

Traditionally investors' first choice in times of financial and economic stress, the yen climbed 1 percent against both the dollar and euro. Those gains took the Japanese currency past long-term resistance around 106.50 yen per dollar and put more pressure on the Bank of Japan to act against the currency's 14 percent rise this year when it ends a regular meeting on Thursday. "While the pound is the worst-performing G10 currency versus the dollar this year, the yen is by far the best," said Derek Halpenny, European Head of Global Markets Research at Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi in London. "The continued surge of the yen will lift expectations that the BOJ may surprise the markets and announce some additional monetary easing."—Reuters

YEN SURGES, STERLING SLUMPS OVER JITTERS

LONDON: The safe-haven yen strengthened across the board yesterday, hitting a three-year high against both the euro and sterling, on worries that Britain could vote to leave the European Union in a referendum in just 10 days' time. Sterling has been dominated by Brexit concerns since late last year, but other major currencies have until now appeared largely protected from angst over the vote.

But with bookmakers and betting exchanges shortening their odds on a vote to leave following a couple of too-close-tocall polls at the weekend, with one putting the "Leave" campaign 10 points ahead, those fears seemed to be spreading yesterday. As investors ditched riskier assets, the yen surged by more than 1 percent to trade at 119.05 yen per euro, its strongest since February 2013. Against sterling, which was down across the board, the yen also climbed as much as 1.8 percent to 149.50, its strongest since August 2013. "All eyes are on the Brexit polls," Credit Agricole's head of G10 currency strategy in London, Valentin Marinov, said. "The yen is among the preferred safe havens at the moment, both because of its positive correlation with risk aversion and because it's geographically removed from the UK," he said. Marinov said, however, that the Bank of Japan would be closely watching the yen and would step in if it got a lot stronger. The BOJ starts a two-day policy meeting on Wednesday.

A shortage of dollars and high safehaven demand for the yen globally are stretching certain dollar-based rates to levels more associated with periods of extreme market stress, raising a red flag for the wider financial system. The benchmark 3-month dollar/yen FX basis-swap was last trading at 102.25, the lowest in at least seven years.

Not all market players believe that the BOJ's verbal warnings about intervention will amount to action. In Frankfurt, Commerzbank strategist Thulan Nguyen said doubts that the BOJ would step in to weaken the yen were keeping upward pressure on the currency. Nguyen said that the yen has been helped higher by expectations that the US Federal Reserve, which also begins a two-day policy meeting on Tuesday, would strike a dovish tone.

GOLD HITS 4-WK HIGH

LONDON: Gold hit its highest since mid-May yesterday, driven higher by a retreat of the dollar and as stocks were and a June 23 vote on whether Britain should leave the European Union. The pound fell to a two-month low against the dollar, pushing gold denominated in sterling to its highest in nearly three years at 909.83 pounds an ounce, up 1.9 percent. Spot gold was up 0.9 percent at \$1,284.76 an ounce at 1145 GMT, off an earlier peak of \$1,286.30. US gold futures for August delivery were up \$11.90 an ounce at \$1,287.80.

Fading expectations for a Federal Reserve rate hike have driven prices sharply higher so far this month. Gold has rallied 6 percent since US payrolls data for May came in weaker than expected on June 3, crushing expectations for an interest rate hike over the summer. DISPLACED ZIMBABWE VILLAGERS WANT ACTION FROM GOVT

MUTARE, Zimbabwe: Villagers re-located to a sprawling government-owned farm complex in eastern Zimbabwe to make way for the nation's biggest diamond field are hoping that President Robert Mugabe's move to take control of the valued resource will benefit them. More than 1,000 families were moved in 2009 from a village adjacent to the Chiadzwa diamond field in Marange to Arda Transau, a 12,000 hectare farm settlement about 40 km to the north with promises of

Arda Transau was billed as a new township with tarred roads, shops and health clinics - but seven years later the villagers say they have yet to see the promised education and health facilities while their homes are crumbling and food is scarce. Seven mining companies licensed to mine the area were ordered in March to leave by Mugabe who accused them of robbing Zimbabwe of wealth. Mugabe took over all diamond operations in the newly-formed Zimbabwe Consolidation Diamond Company (ZCDC).

Some of the affected diamond companies -Mbada Diamonds and Anjin Investments - have since taken the government to court with the issue still pending before the courts. While Mugabe's move could further tarnish the country's image as a risky investment, with investors already unnerved by his drive to force foreignowned firms to sell majority shares to locals, the relocated villagers are hoping it will help them.

Caiphas Mujuru is one of the Arda Transau residents lobbying the government to get ZCDC to address the problems faced by the villagers who are facing severe food shortages. "Life is really difficult here at Arda Transau. We are going hungry," Mujuru told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "We had been promised honey and milk here but it is now a nightmare for us."

Drought and Hunger

When the villagers were moved, each family was given \$1,000 in compensation and a fourroom house but these new dwellings, painted bright yellow, have since developed cracks. Families were promised 11 hectares of arable land including one hectare earmarked for irrigation to run small piggery or poultry projects but this never happened, the villagers say. People in Marange hoped the diamond industry would pump money into reviving failing irrigation schemes as small-scale farmers cannot maintain or replace ageing equipment and national law requires mining companies to help local communities develop.

But the plight of the villagers has been further exacerbated by the current El Nino induced drought which has decimated the southern African nation's crops, leaving 4 million Zimbabweans in a population of 14 million without adequate food supplies. The villagers had the chance to voice their concerns at the Alternative Mining Indaba conference in Mutare this month comprising civic society, communities and stakeholders in the mining sector and legislators promised to help. "We will take your concerns to the Minister of Mines (Walter Chidhakwa)," Prosper Mutseyami, legislator for Musikavanhu constituency in Chipinge district, told the villagers.

However the diamond companies maintain they fulfilled what they were expected to do for the relocated villagers. Anjin Investments, which was a joint venture between the government and Chinese investors, said it complied with the law when it came to the relocation of the villagers. "We did everything required by the law," Anjin Investments' Chief Executive Officer Munyaradzi Machacha told the Thomson Reuters Foundation in a telephone interview. — Reuters

A spokesman for Mbada Diamonds, George Manyaya, said his company was happy with

what they had done for the villagers and the traditional leaders had appreciated their initiatives. But villager Blessing Mufute said the situation at Arda Transau had become so bad that many people were going hungry. "We have been selling the few livestock we had to buy food," said Mufute, adding relocated villagers were in urgent need of jobs, clean water, and electricity as well as food.

In a telephone interview with the Thomson Reuters Foundation, Mines Minister Walter Chidhakwa said local people should not feel they are forgotten. He said the Manicaland Provincial Affairs Minister Mandi Chimene would work with the Ministry of Labor and Social Welfare to provide social and food assistance to the villagers. Contractors would also be asked to work on the poorly built houses at Arda Transau, Chidhakwa added.

But James Mupfumi, who heads the Centre for Research and Development, a local non-governmental investigative organization, is skeptical. "It is disheartening to realize that the Mines Minister has already visited Arda Transau for Zimbabwe Consolidated Diamond Company to relocate more villagers to Arda Transau without addressing previous community grievances," he said. —Reuters

PARK URGES 'BONE-CRUSHING' REFORM ON SHIPBUILDERS

SEOUL: South Korean President Park Geun-Hye yesterday urged "bone-crushing" efforts to overhaul the nation's ailing shipbuilders faced with mounting losses caused by slowing global demand and increased competition. The South's mighty shipbuilders including Hyundai Heavy Industries and Daewoo Shipbuilding and Marine Engineering have dominated the global market for past decades.

But a slump in oil prices and global economic slowdown sapped demand for tankers and container ships, while overcapacity, regional rivalry and the emergence of cheaper Chinese shipbuilders has squeezed profit margins. The South Korean government and creditor banks, including state-run Korea Development Bank, have urged intense restructuring efforts including mass job cuts in recent

"The (shipbuilding) companies, along with creditor banks, should make bonecrushing efforts to revive their businesses," Park said in a speech to Seoul lawmakers. "If we don't carry out a bold restructuring by downsizing the overgrown workforce... and cutting costs, the future of not only the shipbuilders but also the whole economy will be in jeopardy."

Park warned of mass job cuts and an economic slump in the country's southern region where the shipbuilders are based.

try to avoid it, our economy would be devastated and we would face even bigger pain in the end," Park said, adding Seoul would offer financial assistance and job training for those who are laid off.

The nation's so-called "Big Three" shipbuilders including Hyundai, Daewoo and Samsung Heavy Industries racked up collective losses of 8.5 trillion won (\$7.2 billion) last year. They were hailed as a major driver of the country's export-reliant economy - Asia's fourth-largest - before being forced since last year to shed thousands of jobs and assets to stay afloat.

As exports sputtered and domestic demand slowed, South Korea's central bank in April slashed the country's growth outlook for this year to 2.8 percent from the previous three percent. The economy expanded 2.6 percent last year, the lowest since 2012, as crushing household debts prompted more South Koreans to tighten wallets. Total household debts have snowballed to reach a record 1,223 trillion won as of late March as wages stagnated and housing prices continued to rise.

The central bank also cut last week the key interest rate to a record low of 1.25 percent, saying it was aimed at easing the impact of corporate restructuring. CHINA AUTO SALES INCREASE IN MAY

A total of 2.09 million vehicles were sold in China last month, up 9.8 percent from a year ago, the China Association of Automobile Manufacturers (CAAM) said in a statement. The numbers were an increase on the 6.3 percent gain posted in April. The pickup came despite protracted weakness in the world's second-largest economy, where growth slowed to 6.7 percent in the January-March period, the worst quarterly expansion in seven years.

Key economic indicators further deteriorated in May, with official figures released this week showing the increase in fixed-asset investment, a main gauge of infrastructure spending, has slowed to

BEIJING: Car sales in China, the world's its weakest pace in 16 years. Some economists have predicted China's expansion will slow further in the second quarter. Auto sales in the country reached 24.6 million last year, and in October the government sought to boost the market by slashing the purchase tax on passenger cars with small engines.

Sales of passenger cars reached 1.79 million units in May, up 11.3 percent year on year, CAAM data showed. US automaker General Motors outperformed the overall market, reporting earlier this month a 16.9-percent surge in May sales in the country to nearly 300,000 units on the back of strong demand for its sport utility vehicles, multi-purpose vehicles and luxury cars. Japanese car manufacturer Toyota sold more than 100,000 vehicles in China last month, up 12 percent yearon-year, according to Chinese media reports. — AFP

CHINESE GERMANY LEADERS DOWNPLAY TRADE TENSIONS

ANGER PERSISTS OVER CHINA UNDERCUTTING FOREIGN COMPANIES

BEIJING: China does not want a trade war with Europe, Premier Li Keqiang said yesterday at a news briefing with Germany's Chancellor who said she was sure a solution could be found to tensions over Beijing's status in the World Trade Organization. As both sides appeared to play down simmering differences between China and European powers, Airbus Helicopters finalized an agreement to build an assembly line on a Sino-German business bark in China and sell 100 helicopters to a Chinese consortium.

Daimler AG and its Chinese partner, BAIC Motor, also pledged to jointly invest 4 billion yuan (\$608 million) to expand engine production. Beijing sees Germany, China's largest trading partner in the European Union, as influential in the 28-member bloc's debate on the politically sensitive issue of its market economy status. The European Commission is set to accept a change to China's trade status at the WTO by treating it as an economy controlled by the market, not the state. That would make it easier for Beijing to export into

But the Commission also wants to enhance the bloc's ability to defend itself against cheap China's heavily subsidised goods. Reluctance in Europe to give up a method to defend against cheap Chinese imports has set up a looming dispute at the WTO and the prospect of broader trade friction. "China has already fulfilled its obligations on joining the WTO. What's needed now is for the other parties to fulfil the matching obligations they had promised," Li said. "We don't want to fight a trade war because this will benefit nobody."

Banking Tensions

German Chancellor Angela Merkel, who on Sunday began her ninth trip to China since taking office, said: "It does not help us to emotionalise the whole subject. I

am convinced that we can find a solution on the lines of what was promised 15 years ago." The chancellor linked market access for Chinese banks in Germany to a liberalization of the sector in China. "We will certainly pay even more heed to reciprocity in the financial sector than in classic industry," she said, adding that German banks

will be treated equally," he said. Merkel said during a trip to China last year that Germany favoured granting China market economy status in principle but that Beijing still had work to do, including further opening its public procurement markets.

European commissioners are expected to debate the issue in

Merkel has also stressed the need for a level playing field for foreign firms amid growing pressure from industry to confront China more forcefully, and to step up protection for businesses from Chinese cyberattacks. IN RIO FAVELAS, LACK OF PROPERTY RIGHTS CAN BE LETHAL FOR YOUTHS

RIO DE JANEIRO: It is mid-afternoon on a workday in a Rio de Janeiro slum when a young man in a tank top crouches besides a building, walkietalkie on his belt and a large black pistol openly drawn on a main road. As people walk by unperturbed, local residents say he is protecting turf for a drug gang in the Cantagalo favela, a bustling community on a hillside overlooking Copacabana beach in downtown Rio. With an average of 11 murders per day, violent crime remains a major problem in Rio, according to figures from Brazil's Public Security Institute (ISP), a government body.

In favelas like Cantagalo, where people often lack formal documents to prove they own their ramshackle homes, young men are disproportionately impacted by violence, analysts said. "There is no clear definition of who owns the land in Cantagalo," said Vinicius Mariano de Carvalho, a lecturer at King's College London specializing in Brazilian politics. "A population with a sense of ownership of their homes has more direct communitarian ties," he told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "I believe this sense of ownership would reduce the vulnerability to criminality."

Home to more than 20 percent of Rio's residents, favelas first developed as squatter communities. As a result, many favela residents do not have formal title for their homes. As Rio prepares to host the Olympic Games in August, rights groups are concerned that killings by police have increased by more than 50 percent in the past two years, according to ISP figures. In Rio state, 645 people were killed at the hands of police last

year and more than 100 people have been killed by Rio police so far this year, ISP statistics show. "Rio's police (are) the most lethal force in Brazil," Maria Canineu, Brazil director for Human Rights Watch (HRW), told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

Even by the standards of developing countries with high rates of inequality and crime, the number of killings by Rio's cops stand out, according to HRW. In South Africa, a nation of 53 million infamous for high crime rates, police killed 396 people last year. In contrast, the state of Rio de Janeiro with 16 million people had nearly twice as many police killings, and a lower crime rate than South Africa, HRW said. Rio's state police did not respond to phone calls or emails requesting comment, nor did the federal police.

Gangs Take Control

Even though there is no official data linking a lack of official property titles in Rio's poor communities to violence and police killings, many of those killed by police are young men from favelas who are said to be linked to the drugs trade, analysts said. "It's not by chance that drug dealers occupy these kinds of territories with insecure land tenure," Martim Smolka, director of the Latin America program at the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy, a U.S. think-tank, told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

Cantagalo, with its 30,000 people, is one of the favelas formally "pacified" or brought under state control by police. But, as evidenced by young men openly carrying weapons, the police's grip has slipped in recent months, two residents said on condition of anonymity due to security fears. "It's much easier for criminals or drug gangs to occupy areas were residents don't have official, legal (land) rights," Smolka said.

A lack of trust in the state and a poor relationship with police have added to the problem, said Michel Misse, a professor at the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro who studies urban violence. Improving formal ownership rates would "absolutely" lead to better security, Misse told the Thomson Reuters Foundation, as would better government services in poor communities and more training for police.

While favela residents can buy and sell properties in the informal market, a lack of official titles makes it difficult for them to access some government services. Bringing people into the formal system of governance and ownership would help to improve security, said one long-time resident. "The state needs to give them (favela residents) property documents," Rafael Azeredo, owner of a bustling youth hostel in Cantagalo, said.

With a flat screen television and hip, modern decor, Azeredo's Pura Vida hostel is hiring local youths and doing brisk business. A group of tourists from Asia leave the gated home toting surf boards, heading for Copacabana beach. Azeredo opened the place a few years ago. He grew up in the favela and inherited the property from his grandmother. Unlike many of her neighbors, his grandmother had a formal title to her home, so it could be converted into a lawful business with electricity, water and other services. —Reuters

GOLDMAN SACHS DIPS TOE INTO CONSUMER BANKING

NEW YORK: Goldman Sachs, known for financing mega-deals and servicing the ultra-wealthy, is now open to the general public. And its interest in the average American appears to be mutual as thousands of consumers have flocked to its new retail banking service. The company bought GE Capital Bank's online deposit platform in a deal that closed in April. GS Bank, as it is now known, remains fairly simple with an online-only format for establishing savings accounts and investing in CDs. But its rates are competitive - offering above 1 percent for online savings accounts when many others pay less.

Despite no marketing since the deal's signing, GS Bank has added \$1 billion in new deposits. And it plans to expand its offerings with personal loans soon. "We see an opportunity to serve a different customer set than Scherr, CEO of GS Bank. "And we do it at a time when there is a lot of change in how banking is done with and for consumers."

Goldman is hoping to establish a new revenue source with this foray into retail banking as some of its more traditional streams have struggled amid volatile markets and increasing regulation. At the height of the financial crisis, Goldman Sachs converted itself into a bank holding company in part to access types of funding that were previously off limits to it.

Scherr said that the company sees itself as a competitor both to traditional consumer banks and to online startups. It benefits from the name recognition and business acumen of an established financial brand that most startups lack, without the cost of running a network of brick and mortar banks that some of its more established

SIRDAB LAB: A STARTUP HUB FOR ENTREPRENEURS

tarting a business is a lingering goal in the minds of ambitious individuals and disgruntled employees. But many people never take a step towards pursuing their dreams, leading to frustrations and regrets. I honestly can't blame them (or you, if that's how you feel). Creating a business is intimidating, especially if you've never done it before, have experience with failed businesses, or don't see yourself as a "business person". "I'm an engineer"... "I'm an artist"... "I'm an employee"... these labels can hold you back and limit your vision of seeing yourself as a successful business owner. And without a vision, it's hard to make much progress.

'But Where Do I Begin?'

Those who have business ideas often struggle to figure out where to get started, especially when businesses have so many moving parts. I've spoken to aspiring entrepreneurs who worry about marketing before they have a product, or work on a product before speaking to potential customers, or speak to potential customers without knowing how to ask the right questions.

It's painful to see great ideas die because their originators didn't know how to bring them to life. Not only do they suffer, but the world misses out on the value they can bring to our lives. Imagine the world without cars or airplanes or smartphones. Imagine the world without telephones or WhatsApp or Talabat. You are interacting with manmade products 100 percent of your time. Even if you decide to live in the jungle, you're bound to wear clothes others have made or use tools to make your life in the jungle easier (and your chances for survival higher).

Whatever you want to build. Whatever problem you wish to solve. The world will be a better place if you work on your ideas instead of just thinking about them. And that's why Sirdab Lab came to exist.

Enabling Entrepreneurs In early 2014, I attended the

Benchmark Forum, organized by YourAOK. While there, I met Mona Al-Mukhaizeem, who had an interest in starting an accelerator program to support tech startups improve their chances for success. Mona had just returned from San Francisco, having witnessed what a thriving startup climate looks like and personally helped in establishing Alchemist Accelerator in Silicon Valley.

We exchanged ideas about fostering a startup ecosystem and creating a community of entrepreneurs looking to start their own businesses (or joining businesses that channel their passions and appreciate their talents). We spoke about the fragmentation of the entrepreneurial community, where designers, developers, and business people had their own separate events and none were benefiting from the insights and potential collaboration opportunities between each other.

Mona asked me to be her cofounder in turning Sirdab Lab into a reality. I

With that core team, and the over-flowing support from community members, Sirdab Lab became a reality. The initial goal of Sirdab Lab was to help build a community, without waiting for others (public or private) to pave the way. Having frequent events where likeminded individuals can meet, exchange ideas, and inspire one another was our first target to bringing the community together.

Why Community Matters

Sure you can learn a lot from watching YouTube videos, and there are plenty of



agreed to join as I strongly believed in the importance of ecosystems creating startup successes, and wanted to be a part of the economic change Kuwait was witnessing (in 2016, the need for an entrepreneurial ecosystem and the diversification of Kuwait's economy is ever greater). Abdullah Alsayer, founder of MrBabu.com, who Mona met during the Thukhur leadership program became our third cofounder. LEBANON BANKS SAY BOMB ATTACK TARGETS THEM ALL

BOMBING FOLLOWS CLOSURE OF ACCOUNTS

BEIRUT: Lebanese banks said yesterday that a bombing outside the headquarters of one of the country's biggest banks had targeted the entire sector, an attack seen as a dangerous escalation of a crisis over a US law targeting the finances of the Shiite group Hezbollah. The bombing outside the main Blom Bank building in Beirut on Sunday night, which caused damage but no fatalities, followed the closure of accounts considered to be linked to the group by banks afraid of being shut out of the international financial system. No one has claimed responsibility for the attack. Hezbollah, which has not commented on the bombing, has condemned the central bank for implementing a law it views as a breach of sovereignty. The banks say they have no choice but to implement it. Blom Bank, one of Lebanon's biggest banks, has closed more accounts than other banks as a result of the legislation, Lebanese officials say.

Hospitals are among social institutions deemed to be linked to Hezbollah that have had their accounts closed, sources familiar with the matter say. Societies affiliated to Hezbollah run hospitals, schools and social care institutions and the group says the measures are targeting the entire Shiite community. "The Association of Banks confirms that it operates according to the highest levels of professional practice and within the rules prevailing in the international markets," the Association of Banks in Lebanon said in a statement. "This explosion targets the entire banking sector."

The US Hezbollah International Financing Prevention Act (HIFPA), passed in December, threatens to punish any organization or person providing significant finance to Hezbollah, designated a terrorist organization by US law. It poses an unprecedented financial challenge to the Iranian-backed group that dominates Lebanon, its influence underpinned by a powerful armed wing that is fighting in Syria in support of President Bashar Al-Assad.

Political Cost

Though analysts say Hezbollah itself can

operate without bank accounts, the situation is seen as carrying a political cost as it affects its support base in the Shiite community. "They won a military war, they won a political war, but they cannot win a financial war," said one Lebanese banker, discussing the matter on condition of anonymity. "They have to find ways to work in the shadows but the problem is that whoever deals with them will be under scrutiny."

When the law first came into effect, Lebanese banks began closing accounts, including of Hezbollah officials, themselves. The central bank subsequently issued a directive requiring the banks to refer accounts considered linked to Hezbollah to an investigative unit before any measure is taken. In a statement issued last week, Hezbollah's parliamentary bloc stepped up its attack on central bank governor Riad Salameh for "ambiguous and suspicious" statements, and said Hezbollah's education and health institutions could not be undermined.

In an interview with CNBC last week, Salameh said the central bank was making sure banks

had really studied account activity before any decisions are taken. "The law is being implemented," he said. Deflecting criticism, Blom Bank said in a statement yesterday it "represented all sections of Lebanese society and its sects" in terms of its account holders, shareholders and employees.

Parliament Speaker Nabih Berri, a Shiite politician and Hezbollah ally, said the attack on Blom Bank had targeted "Lebanon firstly, and Hezbollah secondly". The banking sector is vitally important to Lebanon as a conduit for billions of dollars of annual remittances that keep its economy afloat. The central bank is widely seen as one of the only effective institutions in the weak Lebanese state.

Nabil Boumonsef, a commentator with An-Nahar newspaper, said the bombing meant the crisis had now become a security issue. "Its danger is that it is connected to the most important, and I can even say the last bastion of protection for Lebanon's social, political and economic stability - the banking sector." —Reuters

INDIA INFLATION INCREASES

NEW DELHI: India's consumer prices rose faster than expected in May due to higher food prices, official figures showed yesterday, which will likely hold off an increase in interest rates. The inflation rate increased by 5.76 percent from a year earlier, substantially higher than 4.8 percent recorded in March and 5.4 percent in April, reported the statistics ministry. The jump was mostly driven by higher food prices due to back to back droughts, reported Bloomberg.

"The recent pickup in Indian inflation is due to higher food prices, not a pickup in overall inflationary pressures," Bill Adams, senior international economist at PNC Financial Services Group, said in a statement to AFP. "Nevertheless, the Reserve Bank of India is likely to leave interest rates on hold for the rest of 2016 after its 25 basis point cut in the repo rate to 6.5 percent on April 5," Adams added. Central bank governor Raghuram Rajan,

who has made taming India's once-runaway prices a priority of his tenure, has set a medium-term goal of limiting inflation to 5 percent by March 2017. The RBI's April rate cut, designed to lower the cost of borrowing and provide a boost to the economy, took the key interest rate to 6.5 percent, its lowest level since early 2011. Economists are now looking ahead to the imminent monsoon, a key factor in food price inflation owing to its outsize impact on India's farmers, whose crops are highly dependent on the annual rains. — AFP

NISSAN PROPILOT LEADS THE WAY FOR AUTONOMOUS TECH AT G7 SUMMIT



DUBAI: European Council President Donald Tusk had a front-seat view to Nissan's ProPilot autonomous drive technology on Thursday at the G7 summit in Ise-shima, Japan. The EC President's car was among a cavalcade of Group of Seven next-generation vehicles.

The Nissan autonomous drive road session was one of a number of events planned during the Japan-hostedG7 Summit on May 26 and 27. The prototype vehicle, based on the Nissan LEAF, a 100 percent electric vehicle, was equipped with special features such as a millimeter wave radar, laser scanners, cameras, and a specialized HMI (Human Machine Interface) to support autonomous driving. The G7 Summit autonomous vehicle demonstration allowed President Tusk to experience how ProPilot technology could navigate roads, incorporating two innovative functionalities. The first, aminiature, high-spec laser scanner that

determines the distance between the vehicle and its surroundings through precise three-dimensional measurements enabling navigation in tight spaces. The second is an eight-way, 360-degree view camera system for accurate routing decisions at intersections and on sharp curving roads. The technologies were tested on roads and highways in Japan and the United States earlier this year.

Nissan will introduce the ProPilot autonomous drive technology in a model in Japan later this year, and then expand availability to Europe, United States and China. ProPilot 1.0 can be used in congested highway traffic conditions.

By 2018, the company plans to implement a multiple-lane, ProPilot autonomous drive technology that allows highway lane change, while by 2020, the new technology will facilitate driving on urban roads, including inter-

HOMAIZI: KFIC PAID KD 4M IN LOAN PAYMENTS DURING 2015

KUWAIT: Plans to divest some unprofitable investments and the diversification of the investment portfolio to decrease risks continue to be implemented. Saleh Yacoub Al-Homaizi, Chairman of Kuwait Finance and Investment Company (KFIC) revealed that KFIC continued during 2015 to decrease the total receivables by 14 percent to approximately KD 20.8 million. This figure compares to approximately KD 24 million by the end of 2014. This decrease was observed after it paid KD 4 million to banks and creditors as per the loans agreements. As such, KFIC has paid KD 26 million for the first quarter of 2016 out of its total active loans after the restructure that occurred in 2012.

Al-Homaizi stated during the Annual General Meeting that was held yesterday that KFIC during 2015, KFIC liquidated a considerable part of its listed and categorized investments for trade. They are now for sale to decrease the exposure on the disturbed stock markets. The associates' performance has also improved. They achieved good results during the year as well as good revenues from the new investments that KFIC bought at the end of 2014 and the beginning of 2015, which compensated from the stock invest-

Homaizi pointed out that KFIC's ownership rights increased during 2015 by 3 percent to KD 41.5 million in comparison with approximately KD 40.3 million during 2014. On the other hand, the company's total assets have declined by 3 percent to KD 3.62 million as of December 31, 2015 due to the payment of receivables as per the loans agreements.

Homaizi also indicated that KFIC will continue to implement its plans to divest of some of its unprofitable direct investments during the period from 2016 to 2018. Al Homaizi pointed that the company successfully divested of its unprofitable investments in the Arab Finance House, Gulf Investment Corporation and Credit Information Network (CINET) during the past two years.

Homaizi also clarified that KFIC started diversifying its investment portfolio in order to decrease risks and guarantee the generation of a revenue that covers the capital costs and generates a constant cash flow. In their diversification efforts, KFIC has entered the real estate market through new profitable assets during 2014 and 2015 with an approximately 5.3 million KD investment. The revenues attained from those investments were approximately 394,000 KD during 2015. Homaizi stated that KFIC's operational net

profit before interest and tax and unusual items were 1.7 million KD for 2015 in comparison with 2.3 million KD for 2014 which signifies a 26 percent or 0.6 million KD decline. The decline is mainly due to the decrease in in stock prices and the volume of transactions in the Kuwait Stock Exchange during 2015 by a large margin. In spite of such decline, KFIC continued to achieve positive results. The company's net profit was approximately 847,000 KD in 2015 in comparison with approximately 1.5 million KD in 2014 which signifies an 653,000 KD decline.

Homaizi emphasized that the aforementioned financial indicators reflect the strength of

KFIC's financial position. He also clarified that the company will monitor its investments and operation as per the suggested work plan that is associated with the restructure plan that was implemented. He said that KFIC is now working on fully committing and adhering to the Capital Markets Authority's governance rules requirements by June 2016.

It is noteworthy that the General Assembly agreed to all the items on the agenda including the refusal to distribute profits for 2015 and support the company's reserves by KD 300,000.

GULF STOCKS MOSTLY SOFT BUT SAUDI FIRM

MIDEAST MARKETS REPORT

DUBAI: Most stock markets in the Middle East edged down yesterday after global bourses and oil prices fell further and Egypt's Orascom Telecom saw a second day of steep losses after an acquisition plan was called off but Saudi Arabian shares were firm. Riyadh's index recovered from early weakness to end up 0.3 percent as Saudi Electricity Co (SEC) climbed 2.5 percent. SEC said at the weekend that it was inviting expressions of interest from companies to build two solar power plants; the firms would invest in the plants and sell electricity to SEC in deals that could become models for future infrastructure projects under Saudi Arabia's economic reform plan. Other blue chips also supported the market with the largest listed Islamic lender, Al Rajhi Banking, gaining 1.7 percent. Retailer Fawaz Al Hokair rose 3.4 percent. But Dar Al Arkan Real Estate, which had surged nearly 30 percent since news that it was in talks with the government to build housing units under last week's economic plan, fell 1.6 percent to 6.35 riyals. Eight analysts polled by Reuters have a 5.94 riyal mean price target for the stock.

Many portfolio managers are still sizing up the likely impact of the economic reform plan on companies' earnings; they have largely stayed clear of making long-term commitments to Saudi shares. Another factor looming for the market is international index compiler MSCI, which is to announce after the close on Tuesday whether it will put Saudi Arabia on review for possible inclusion in its emerging markets index as early as mid-2017.

Inclusion would bring billions of dollars of passive foreign funds into the market but fund managers are split on whether Saudi Arabia is likely to be put on review this year. Mohammad Shabbir, head of equity funds at Dubai-based Rasmala Investment Bank, said there was a high possibility for MSCI to include Saudi Arabia in its index next year because of an easing of foreign ownership restrictions and reforms to the trading environment announced in early May.

MSCI will also announce today whether China A-shares will be upgraded to its emerging markets index. If they are, this would dilute the weightings of other Middle Eastern markets in the index - the United Arab Emirates, Qatar and Egypt - causing outflows of passive funds from them. "The impact of the outflow will be short-lived," said Shabbir. Mohamed El-Jamal, head of capital markets at Abu Dhabi's Waha Capital, said he was expecting about \$100 million of outflows from the UAE, Qatar and Egypt if China A-share inclusion went ahead.

Dubai, Egypt

Dubai's index lost 0.4 percent, weighed down by further declines in large caps. Emaar Properties fell 1 percent, leaving it down 9 percent from its late April high. In Abu Dhabi, heavyweight banking shares were the main drag on the index, which slipped 0.1 percent. National Bank of Abu Dhabi declined 2.4 percent. Qatar's main index dropped 0.9 percent to close at the day's low of 9,704 points. A sell-off in blue chips weighed on the bourse, with real estate developer Ezdan Holding slumping 3.2 percent. Cairo's main index edged down 0.1 percent as Orascom Telecom retreated a further 4.6 percent. It slid 5.7 percent on Sunday after a plan by its unit Beltone to acquire CI Capital from Commercial International Bank (CIB) was called off because it failed to win regulatory approval. Orascom said it would re-engage in the acquisition once all "regulatory obstacles" were overcome, but the failure of the deal was seen by some investors

as a blow to prominent businessman Naguib Sawiris, who family controls Orascom, and to the Egyptian investment climate in general. However, shares in CIB bounced 1.7 percent on Monday.

THE AMBIGUITY OF CEM, DIGITAL AND BIG DATA

ithout any doubt the world has gone the digital direction becoming more focused on the Customer experience while trying to map customer interactions and generating useful information that will increase satisfaction, leading to continuous business growth. In-line with this trend, you will notice that people are more involved in exploring and researching what I like to call the 'three words'- Big data, Digital and Customer Experience Management (CEM), especially if they are working in service oriented sectors like Telecom, Banking and Travel and

Keeping in mind the size and amount of information being exchanged daily brings up an important question - "Is there any clear common understanding that defines the Three Words? And can they really be separated?"

Unfortunately, there is none at the moment as this area is considered as a

growing non-mature space. Definitions and concepts keeping evolving with new approaches, strategies and best practices. We will try to address these areas from our understanding hoping it will help better understand and hence embrace these new trends.

Starting with the Customer Experience (CX): It is the perceived experience by a customer to a certain product or service, the experience can be good, bad or normal. The ability to measure customer experience and manage this information, i.e. analyze it, improve it and reuse it to derive new services and products personalized to the customer is what we call Customer Experience Management. It is important to understand that the experience is holistic and cannot be segregated and hence the challenge in capturing it. In the CEM world this is referred to as measuring customer experience throughout the customer life cycle and against all touch points.

Let me give you an example. The

experience of a customer who wants to stay in a particular hotel starts from the time he visits the hotel's website to book a room until he checks out of the hotel. This includes his experience at the time of check in, while using the facilities of the hotel and finally when he makes the final payment. The question that now arises is how to measure his experience and ensure that the customer would not only return to the same hotel but also share his experience and recommend the hotel to his friends and colleagues which in turn would translate to more business for the hotel.

Digital: To explain this simply, digital is the form of the data that customers generates during their interactions with different touch points. It is also denotes the the channels that the customer has used to transfer this data. It is definitely advantageous to have data captured in digital form as it helps improve the process of collecting the data thus increasing the ability to process it further. If we go back to our hotel example, we can consider the hotel website that the customer used to book his room as the digital channel and the information that he was required to fill and the online payment he made are in the form of digital data.

Big Data: This is the data that is generated by all customer transactions for each and every product/service they have experienced.

Let's go back to the hotel example to understand this a little more. Here "big data" is the data generated by the customer (his profile, the country he is travelling from, number of days of stay, the room type, the means of payment, utilities access in the hotel like pool, gym, restaurants, feedback, complaints if any, etc.). It is of course easy to collect this type of data from one customer but imagine the size of the same data when collected for all the customers of the hotel over a long period of time. This cumulative data of all customers is what we call 'big data'. In fact in reality, customers can use multiple services at the

same time generating more data.

It is important to be able to define and distinguish the different meanings of the 'three words' distinctly and although we believe they all come together in one gigantic process while working back to back as one of them is the input (Big Data), the second is the form and channel of the data (Digital) and the final one (CEM) is the engine and Processes which when applied to this data helps improve both customer satisfaction and business growth.

COMING LATER TODAY: APPLE'S NEXT **BIG SOFTWARE IMPROVEMENTS**

SAN FRANCISCO: With sales of Apple's flagship iPhone slowing, the spotlight is on the company's hunt for its next big thing. Apple's annual software developers conference, which kicks off Monday, will be its next big opportunity to show the world what's coming next.

Artificial intelligence, and Apple's wisecracking digital assistant Siri, could play a big role. Of course, Apple is expected to unveil a number of other advances - software improvements for its iPhones, iPads and Mac computers and a possible overhaul of its music service chief among them. After Apple's dust-up with the FBI earlier this year over iPhone security, it might also announce new security measures to protect users' data.

But Al is emerging as a major new tech battleground, one where Apple may have some ground to make up. Siri made a big splash when it debuted five years ago. But as other tech giants jockey to build intelligent "chat bots" and voicecontrolled home systems capable of more challenging artificial-intelligence feats, Siri at times no longer seems cutting edge.

Making siri smarter

Apple is expected to demonstrate an upgrade to Siri's smarts. The main question is whether it will be enough to keep up with rivals like Amazon, Google, Facebook and others who are racing to create digital services that consumers will find indispensable for shopping, chatting, controlling other appliances and simply getting through their daily lives. "Google Now has kind of eaten their lunch," said Chris Monberg, cofounder of Boomtrain, a startup that makes artificial intelligence software used by online retailers. Monberg argues that Google's proactive digital assistant provides more useful reminders, recommendations and tips on local weather or traffic, largely because it reads his email and other data from his Android phone and crunches it with sophisticated algorithms on Google's powerful servers.

Amazon's Echo home speaker likewise has its fans; it recognizes informal voice commands and can order flowers, pizza or a ride to the airport. Facebook, Google and Microsoft are also working to incorporate intelligent "bots" into the voice- and text-messaging services that people use to chat with their friends.

In some respects, Siri remains plenty competitive, at least so long as you stick with Apple's other services. If an iPhone owner uses Google's Gmail, for instance, Apple's software may not scan those emails for useful information. But Jan Dawson, a tech analyst at Jackdaw Research, notes that Siri can volunteer helpful reminders from the Apple calendar, offer suggestions based on a user's location, or search for images stored in Apple's photo app.

Getting to know you

Apple, however, has been largely unwilling to pry too deeply into your personal information. And some experts say that puts it at a disadvantage compared to Google, which has compiled vast quantities of data - about both individual users and consumer trends - from its search engine, Gmail, maps and other well-liked online services. (Many of those Google services remain popular on the iPhone, despite Apple's best efforts to replace them. With AI, "systems get much better the more they know about the user," said Alan Black, an expert in voiceenabled technology at Carnegie Mellon

Apple collects plenty of data from its users, but hasn't "focused on connecting all the dots," said Raj Singh, co-founder of Tempo AI, an artificial intelligence startup acquired by Salesforce.com last year.

Google, of course, makes money from advertising that's keyed to individual interests. Apple, which makes most of its money from iPhones, says its software respects customer privacy by working with an individual's data on the iPhone or iPad, while anonymizing information that's uploaded to its servers.

"We don't mine your email, your photos, or your contacts in the cloud to learn things about you," Apple VP Craig Federighi said at the company's Worldwide Developers Conference last year. "We honestly just don't want to

"Siri, reserve my table"

Apple declined comment on plans for Siri. Last fall, however, Apple acquired a startup that makes AI software specifically for mobile devices, and another that helps computers carry on extensive voice conversations. And tech news sites have reported Apple may loosen its restrictions on Siri's ability to work directly with other companies' software. That could enable Siri to book a restaurant reservation on command, or order a ride from a car service, rather than show a link to an app like Open Table or Uber and requiring the user to do the rest.

Experts say the quality of Apple's software and online services is increasingly critical to maintaining its popularity with

Services like Siri, Apple Music and Apple Pay add significant value to the iPhone and other Apple devices, Dawson said. "They're important to keeping the Apple ecosystem attractive."—AP

JAKARTA'S TRAFFIC TRIALS GIVE RISE TO A TECH SUCCESS

JAKARTA: The Indonesian capital's reputation as one of the most congested cities is typically not an advantage with investors. But one company has become the country's most visible technology success with an app that relieves some of the pain of its maddening traffic. The ride-hailing apps that are now part of daily life from New York to New Delhi and London are usually used to summon cars. Jakarta, the world's sixth-largest urban sprawl and by some measures the most car-clogged, needed something different.

In hindsight, the Go-Jek mobile app for hailing rides on motorcycles, to dodge and weave through traffic, was a no-brainer. But its sudden success over the past two years took even its founder by surprise. The app's name is a play on "ojek," the Indonesian word for freelance motorcycle taxis, now a rare sight in Jakarta after many drivers joined Go-Jek's green-jacketed, GPS-coordinated ranks.

"We really had no idea it would be adopted so widely and so quickly," said Nadiem Makarim, who admits the company and its app struggled to keep pace when tens of thousands began downloading it.

Makarim believes Jakarta's carmageddon had arrived at a "pain point" of huge unmet demand for a solution. "Smartphone penetration was at an all-time high in Jakarta, traffic was at an all-time high," he said. "Getting yourself or your things from A to B in the quickest way possible could only be achieved by motorcvcles."

As by far the biggest economy in Southeast Asia, making up a third of the region's gross domestic product, Indonesia has also attracted Uber and Go-Jek's fiercest competitor, Malaysia's Grab, which is headed by Makarim's Harvard classmate Anthony Tan.

Analysts say both Uber and Grab have greater scale and resources than Go-Jek, crucial for sustaining losses in the transport app industry's early stages and for sustaining investments in the behind-the-scenes technology that makes the apps easy for people to use. Go-Jek has built on its strategy of providing rides to introduce a slew of additional Goservices to the app, including delivering food, groceries, cleaners, massage therapists and beauticians to homes.

The Go-Send document pickup and delivery service and Go-Food are the company's two biggest businesses after rides, Makarim said. Go-Food, he said, has become the biggest food delivery business in Southeast Asia by number of transactions. "Go-Jek's vision is to escape competition by creating an on-demand platform for anything our consumer wants," he said. "We're not stuck on our identity based on what we think it should be. We let the market decide what they want us to be."

Florian Hoppe, a partner at consulting company Bain who specializes in technology, said Go-Jek's approach is "fairly unique" but fits the situation in Jakarta and other Indonesian cities where service businesses are hobbled by transportation problems.

"It's hard to predict where this will be going," he said. "In the long-term, specialized services will likely have an edge but Indonesia has enough uniqueness, market protection and scale, that (Go-Jek) could be very successful in the long-term too."

Makarim dreamed up Go-Jek for an independent study project while at Harvard Business School and started it as a sideline business when he returned to Indonesia in the summer. For its first three years, it operated like a call center. It became a mobile app after Makarim turned his attention to it fulltime from mid-2014.

Like elsewhere, ride hailing apps are drawing an angry backlash from taxi drivers as their incomes drop. In March, a protest by thousands of taxi drivers that paralyzed the capital turned violent, with cabbies brawling in the streets with green-jacketed drivers from Go-Jek and Grab.

Go-Jek says it has more than 200,000 drivers around Indonesia but the pain for taxis seems most acute in Jakarta, where all the ride hailing services are battling fiercely for customers, pushing fares to rock bottom.

Since a Go-Jek trip within the city costs only about 12,000 rupiah (90 cents) outside of peak hours, the company is burning through its investment cash because in Jakarta the fares are lower than what it pays drivers.

Yet the apps have proven so useful to people in a city where officials estimate congestion causes losses of \$3 billion a year that attempts to ban them on the basis of claims of unfair competition have failed.

When the transport minister issued a directive last December banning app-based ojeks, the public outcry was such that President Joko "Jokowi" Widodo quickly overruled the decision.

The nationalistic appeal of a home-grown tech success is also a potent advantage for the company. "We want to make Indonesia proud that this is a uniquely Indonesian company that was started here," Makarim said. "We have a huge competitive advantage as the first mover and from a sense of growing nationalism and pride that we are the tech brand of Indonesia right now."—AP

MASSIVE N KOREA CYBER ATTACK THWARTED AFTER HACKING S.KOREA

SEOUL: North Korea has hacked into more than 140,000 computers at large South Korean conglomerates and government agencies and planted malicious codes that may have been intended for a massive cyber attack that has been thwarted, a news report said on yesterday.

The hacking originated from an internet address traced to the North Korean capital and targeted a software used by about 160 companies and government agencies to manage their computer networks, Yonhap news agency reported, citing the police.

The internet address was identical to the one used in a 2013 cyber attack against South Korean banks and broadcasters that froze their computer systems for more than a week. South Korea blamed the North for that attack.

The South Korean police agency's cyber investigation unit uncovered the hacking and worked with the companies and agencies affected to neutralize the malicious codes and prevent them from being used in a large-scale cyber attack, Yonhap said.

The police's cyber investigation unit could not immediately confirm the report. South Korea has been on heightened alert against the threat of cyber attacks by North Korea after it conducted a nuclear test in January and a long-range rocket launch last month that led to new UN sanctions.

In March, the South's spy agency said it had intercepted an attempt to hack into the South's computer networks to attack the transport system's control network, blaming the North for the attempt.

North Korea has worked for years to develop the ability to disrupt or destroy computer systems that control public services such as telecommunications and other utilities, according to a North Korean defector familiar with the effort.

The United States accused North Korea of a cyber attack against Sony Pictures in 2014 that led to the studio cancelling the release of a comedy based on the fictional assassination of the country's leader, Kim Jong Un. North Korea denied the accusation.—Reuters

DASMAN DIABETES INSTITUTE: KUWAIT'S STAUNCH BULWARK AGAINST DIABETES

KUWAIT: The prevalence of diabetes in Kuwait is amongst the highest in the world, and the country's government and non-government organizations have been confronting the non-communicable disease and its risk factors at all fronts.

On the frontline of this war, stands the Dasman Diabetes Institute as a main defender of Kuwaitis' health against the disease which represents an enormous challenge to Kuwait's health system.

The DDI encompasses a multi-disciplinary team of national and international professionals who combine their knowledge and experience to provide quality diabetes care, Director-General of the Dasman Diabetes Institute (DDI) Dr. Qais Al-Duwairi told KUNA.

He pointed out that the DDI's research department aimed to explore the mechanisms of the diabetes and its complications to help provide practical solutions

for the prevention and treatment of this disease, he argued. He emphasized that the DDI researchers were also keen on translating the findings of their studies into clinical practices to improve the health conditions of the patients.

Al-Duwairi stated that the DDI has been prioritizing researches focusing on upgrading healthcare services offered to diabetic people. The DDI has entered into strategic partnerships with the Kuwait University and Kuwait's Ministry of Health as well as a slew of international healthcare and educational institutions such as the US-based Harvard University and Georgetown University, he said.

He added that the DDI researches tackle everything related to diabetes before and after the disease diagnosing. The researches cover a wide array of topics including clinical diabetology, immunology, biochemistry, molecular biology and pediatrics, he said.

He unveiled that the DDI teams are

studies that were approved by the Ethical Review Committee. Four of those researches touches upon knowledgebased awareness, lifestyle, breastfeeding and food role in prevention and reducing the incidence of diabetes, he said

Al-Duwairi noted that some 20 clinical experiments were carried out in in the DDI since 2010. These experiments have boosted the DDI status as one of the main diabetes research centers in the world, he said. For her part, DDI Researcher Dr. Maisa Mahmoud Kamkar disclosed that the findings of 13 the DDI researches would be announced this year. She explained that the researches take long time because of the high DDI standards and procedures such as idea approval, samples taking and clinical work, waiting for the results, a review to the results.

She noted that the DDI role is to help prevent, control and mitigate the impact of diabetes and related conditions in

working on 61 diverse researches and Kuwait through effective programs of research, training, education, and health promotion and thereby improve quality of life in the population. "Despite the progress achieved in the past years, more researches and efforts are still needed to improve the diabetes diagnoses, treatment, prevention, medicine and patients lifestyle." Al-Duwairi told KUNA.

> Al-Duwairi stated that a research carried out by the Kuwait Scotland eHealth Innovation Network has shown a remarkable rise in prevalence of diabetes among children and adolescents (under 14 years old) by 1.7 folds in the past five years. The DDI marks this month the 10th anniversary of its inauguration by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. The Institute was founded by the Kuwait Foundation for the Advancement of Sciences (KFAS) to be in charge of studies related to diabetes. The Kuwait adult population has the sixth highest prevalence of diabetes

in the world, affecting approximately 24 percent of the population. A number of potential causes for the rising trends in diabetes have been identified, including genetic predisposition, westernized diet, lack of physical activity and limited recreational facilities.

Kuwait also has one of the highest levels of obesity in the world. It is estimated that threequarters of the adult population are overweight or obese with the latter accounting for between 30 and 50 percent of the population.

These problems are not restricted to the adult population. The prevalence of diabetes in children and young adults is rising, estimated to be around 33 per 100,000. Kuwait also has a high prevalence of overweight and obesity in children and adolescents. As the number of cases of diabetes and obesity continues to rise these patients place an ever increasing burden on the healthcare system. — KUNA

When stars seek medical care, RISK OF 'VIP SYNDROME' LOOMS

NEW YORK: One doctor delivered test results to Prince's home. Another sent his son, who wasn't a physician, on a cross-country flight to bring medication to the music star.

It's not clear if any doctor could have averted the fentanyl overdose that killed the singer in April. But his death may offer evidence for how the special treatment often afforded the rich and famous can result in worse health care than ordinary Americans receive. It's a pattern identified in medical literature as early as 1964 and it has a name: "VIP Syndrome."

Experts agree that doctors treating Michael Jackson and Joan Rivers lost their bearings and made fatal mistakes in the glare of their patients' fame. Eleanor Roosevelt is another example. "There are a number of red flags that go up," said Dr. Robert Klitzman, who directs Columbia University's bioethics master's program. "Prince was one of the wealthiest musicians alive. Did he get appropriate care? VIP Syndrome may have been involved."

First described by Dr. Walter Weintraub of the University of Maryland School of Medicine in a 1964 paper, VIP Syndrome is shorthand for how the influence of wealth and the allure of fame can cause doctors to veer into risky territory when they cater to the demands of a star or his entourage. Stars may reject medical advice or demand ineffective or harmful treatments. Starstruck doctors may order unnecessary tests or not enough tests. Hospital administrators may meddle in decisions if the patient is a potential financial donor.

Jackson's personal doctor, Conrad Murray, spent two years in prison after his involuntary manslaughter conviction in the King of Pop's 2009 death. Jackson had requested a surgical anesthetic, propofol, to help him sleep, calling it his "milk," according to trial testimony. Prosecutors said Murray supplied the drug and didn't notice when Jackson stopped breathing.

Eagerness to please apparently pushed Murray far beyond the boundaries of reasonable treatment, said Dr. Stephen Dinwiddie of Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. Another doctor took a cellphone photo of Joan Rivers on the operating table, according to a recently settled malpractice lawsuit. That's a clear sign of clouded judgment, Dinwiddie said.

The comedian's family accepted an undisclosed amount to settle the complaint in her 2014 death following a routine endoscopy. The family alleged doctors performed an unauthorized medical procedure and failed to act as Rivers' vital signs deteriorated.

Eleanor Roosevelt may have been misdiagnosed because of VIP Syndrome, said New York University School of Medicine's Dr. Barron Lerner, who published a paper based on his review of her medical record. The first lady died in 1962 of tuberculosis, which could have been caught earlier if she'd had a bone marrow biopsy in time, Lerner said. Instead, she was misdiagnosed with aplastic anemia and treated with steroids, which may have reduced her body's ability to fight infection. "Lots of doctors were involved, and no

one was specifically in charge," Lerner said, citing one hallmark of VIP Syndrome. "She was an opinionated patient, and that made it more challenging to take care of her."

The timeline of events surrounding Prince suggests missed opportunities, experts said, including a close call less than a week before he died on April 21. On April 15, Prince's private plane made an emergency stop in Illinois on a flight from Atlanta back to Minnesota. The Associated Press and other media organizations, citing anonymous sources, reported that first responders gave him an antidote commonly used to reverse suspected opioid overdoses.

"You'd think someone would say, 'Let's get him into treatment," Klitzman said. Instead, a week passed before Prince's associates called a California addiction and pain specialist, Dr. Howard Kornfeld. Authorities have not said whether he had a prescription for the fentanyl and, if not, how he obtained it. Much about the musician's care remains unknown. Was Prince who reportedly suffered from hip and knee pain related to years of athletic stage performances already seeing doctors well-versed in the risks of opioids? If he became addicted to painkillers. did anyone consider referring him to a nearby and highly regarded treatment option, Minnesota's Hazeldon Betty Ford?

Kornfeld sent his son Andrew in an effort to persuade Prince to seek long-term care at his Recovery Without Walls center in Mill Valley. California, according to William Mauzy, the Kornfelds' attorney. Andrew Kornfeld carried a small dose of buprenorphine, which is used to ease withdrawal symptoms and cravings, Mauzy

has said. The younger Kornfeld arrived too late. He was among those who discovered Prince's body. Mauzy did not respond to the AP's questions regarding Kornfeld's approach to celebrity care. The actions of Dr. Michael Todd Schulenberg, a Minnesota family physician, are also under scrutiny. Schulenberg saw Prince on April 7 and 20, the day before he died. He told investigators he prescribed medications for him, but a search warrant did not specify which drugs. Schulenberg arrived "on the death scene" at some point, according to the warrant. He told a detective he was there to drop off test results.

That house call suggests VIP Syndrome, Klitzman said. Schulenberg's attorney, who would not comment specifically about Prince, said the doctor has made periodic house calls ever since he was in residency, when he was trained to do them.

During the visits, he carries only a stethoscope and "does not administer medications or perform any type of procedures in a patient's home," attorney Amy Conners said in an email to The Associated Press.

To guard against VIP Syndrome, the Cleveland Clinic published nine principles of caring for VIPs in 2011. The document warns doctors against bending the rules. In the end, doctors must monitor a tendency toward any unusual practices, said Lerner, author of "When Illness Goes Public: Celebrity Patients and How We Look at Medicine." "When you're contemplating superhuman or very heroic, unorthodox behavior in your zeal to help a famous patient," Lerner said, "that's where you've got to take a deep breath and reassess." — AP

But he continues to stress that Mike remains terminally ill from spindle cell sarcoma, with perhaps a year or two to live. Mike was treated after hours June 1 at the Mary Byrd Perkins-Our Lady of the Lake Cancer Center, so no human patients were there. The center's chief of medical physics, Jonas Fontenot, says dealing with a 420pound tiger felt surreal. It took more than eight people, using a sling system created by the veterinary staff, to lift the anesthetized animal.—AP

VAPING TEENS MORE APT TO MOVE ON TO REGULAR CIGARETTES

NEW YORK: Older teens who try electronic cigarettes have six times the odds of trying regular cigarettes within two years than those who never puffed on the devices, a study published yesterday found.

"We're concerned that kids who experiment with e-cigarettes may be moving on to other types of tobacco products, like combustible cigarettes, which are arguably a lot more dangerous," said University of Southern California researcher Jessica Barrington-Trimis, lead author of the study published in the journal Pediatrics.

E-cigarettes are handheld electronic devices that vaporize a fluid typically including nicotine and a flavor component. Using them is called "vaping." The researchers based their findings on surveys conducted by USC involving about 300 high school students in southern California. In 2014, about half of the students said they had at least tried an e-cigarette.

In a 2015 follow-up survey, about 40 percent of those who had tried an e-cigarette by the previous year had tried regular cigarettes. That compared to about 11 percent of those who said they had not tried an e-cigarette in the prior year's survey. After adjusting the statistics for gender, ethnicity, grade and parental education, the researchers calculated that the teens who tried the e-cigarettes had six times the odds of taking up smoking than those who never tried them. When the researchers looked at teens who said on the first survey that they had no intention to smoke, the risk of moving from e-cigarettes to regular cigarettes by the next year was 10 times greater than those who never vaped.

Barrington-Trimis said the high risk among teens committed to not smoking "suggests this is not just occurring among kids who intended to smoke anyway." The survey participants were 11th and 12th grade students who all were least 18 years old by the second survey. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommended in 2015 that the devices be regulated as tobacco products due to concerns they would lead teens to regular cigarettes and also expose their develop-

ing brains to nicotine. The US Food and Drug Administration last month took wide-ranging steps to crack down on e-cigarettes and banned sales to anyone under age 18. — Reuters

INDIA'S ASSAM STATE MAKES NEW PLANS TO HALT RHINO POACHING

GAUHATI, India: The newly elected government of the northeast Indian state of Assam has launched plans to crack down on the poaching of the area's famed one-horned rhinos, an official said Saturday.

The state's Kaziranga National Park is home to the world's largest population of the rare rhinos, with more than 2,000 of the species. While overall poaching deaths have dropped

over the last few years, a series of rhino killings this year has led the new government to renew anti-poaching efforts.

The state's new environment minister, Pramila Rani Brahma, said that local police have been asked to join the offensive against poaching. Previously, Kaziranga's forest rangers and anti-poaching staff handled this responsibility on their own.

Brahma said allegations that some park staff may be involved in the trade in rhino parts were also being investigated. On Tuesday, as Brahma and other officials visited Kaziranga to discuss the threat of poaching, a female rhino was shot dead by poachers in the vicinity. In April, poachers killed a rhino at the 480-square-kilometer (185-square-mile) park hours after a visit by Britain's Prince William

and his wife, Kate. The royal couple had spent several hours at Kaziranga in hopes of drawing attention to the plight of endangered animals, including the park's one-horned rhinos.

4 PEOPLE DIED IN APPARENT BEAR ATTACKS IN NORTHERN JAPAN

TOKYO: Four people foraging for edible wild plants or bamboo shoots were killed in bear attacks in a small area of northern Japan in three weeks, police said yesterday, and are warning people to take precautions.

The bodies of the three men and one woman had bites and scratches presumably made by "a large animal," Kazuno Police Station spokesman Noboru Abukawa said. He added that police heard roars of a bear or bears and saw bears from a helicopter while searching for the victims.

The victims, who were aged 65 to 79, were killed in a mountainous area within a 2.5-kilometer (1.6-mile) radius since May 20. Police are not sure of the cause of the sudden increase in the number of bear attacks. Abukawa said there had been no deaths from bear attacks in the last five years in Kazuno. The city in Akita prefecture is more than 600 kilometers (37 miles) north of Tokyo.

On Friday, hunters shot and killed a female Asiatic black bear with a body length of 1.3 meters (4.3 feet) about 20 meters southwest of where the fourth victim was found dead, but Abukawa said it was unclear whether the dead bear had attacked the victims

Police are enhancing patrols and have distributed fliers alerting residents around the mountainous area to exercise caution. In nearby lwate prefecture, eight people were attacked by bears on six occasions between April 1 and June 7, according to its prefectural website. The lwate site urges people going into the mountains to bring a bell or turn on a radio to avoid bears.

Nationally, 168 bear attacks have been reported between April 2014 and March 2016, according to Environment Ministry data, and 176 people suffered injuries or died in those attacks. — AP

EXCLUSIVE: STUDIES FIND 'SUPER BACTERIA' IN RIO'S OLYMPIC VENUES, TOP BEACHES

Scientists have found dangerous drugresistant "super bacteria" off beaches in Rio de Janeiro that will host Olympic swimming events and in a lagoon where rowing and canoe athletes will compete when the Games start on Aug. 5.

The findings from two unpublished academic studies seen by Reuters concern Rio's most popular spots for tourists and greatly increase the areas known to be infected by the microbes normally found only in hospitals.

They also heighten concerns that Rio's sewage-infested waterways are unsafe. A study published in late 2014 had shown the presence of the super bacteria - classified by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) as an urgent public health threat - off one of the beaches in Guanabara Bay, where sailing and wind-surfing events will be held during the Games. study, said the compact beaches was the tation in the me people. The first of the two new studies, reviewed in September by scientists at the Interscience Conference on Antimicrobial Agents and Chemotherapy in San Diego, showed the presence of the microbes at five of Rio's showcase beaches, including the ocean-front Copacabana, where open-water and triathlon swimming will take place.

The other four were Ipanema, Leblon, Botafogo and Flamengo. The super bacteria can cause hard-to-treat urinary, gastrointestinal, pulmonary and bloodstream infections, along with meningitis. The CDC says studies show that these bacteria contribute to death in up to half of patients infected.

The second new study, by the Brazilian federal government's Oswaldo Cruz Foundation lab, which will be published next month by

the American Society for Microbiology, found the genes of super bacteria in the Rodrigo de Freitas lagoon in the heart of Rio and in a river that empties into Guanabara Bay.

Waste from countless hospitals, in addition to hundreds of thousands of households, pours into storm drains, rivers and streams crisscrossing Rio, allowing the super bacteria to spread outside the city's hospitals in recent years. Renata Picao, a professor at Rio's federal university and lead researcher of the first study, said the contamination of Rio's famous beaches was the result of a lack of basic sanitation in the metropolitan area of 12 million people. "These bacteria should not be present in these waters. They should not be present in the sea," said Picao from her lab in northern Rio, itself enveloped by stench from Guanabara Bay.

Cleaning the city's waterways was meant to be one of the Games' greatest legacies and a high-profile promise in the official 2009 bid document Rio used to win the right to host South America's first Olympics. That goal has instead transformed into an embarrassing failure, with athletes lamenting the stench of sewage and complaining about debris that bangs into and clings to boats in Guanabara Bay, potential hazards for a fair competition.

Situation getting worse

Picao's study, which has undergone internal reviews at Rio's federal university, analyzed water samples taken between September 2013 and September 2014. Using 10 samples taken at five beach locations, the study found super bacteria were most present at Botafogo beach, where all samples were positive.

Flamengo beach, where spectators will gather to watch Olympic sailors vie for medals, had the super bacteria in 90 percent of samples. Ten percent of Copacabana's samples had the microbes.

Ipanema and Leblon beaches, the most popular with tourists, had samples that tested positive for super bacteria 50 and 60 percent of the time, respectively. The Oswaldo Cruz study of the Olympic lagoon, which was peer reviewed, is based on water samples taken in 2013. It found that the lake is a potential breeding ground for super bacteria and their spread through the city.

While the studies both use water samples that are from 2013 and 2014, Picao and other experts said they had seen no advances in sewerage infrastructure in Rio to improve the situation. Valerie Harwood, an expert in recreational water contamination and antibioticresistant bacteria at the University of South Florida who was not involved in the studies, said that if anything, things were getting worse, as the super bacteria naturally spread by infecting other microbes. The contamination has prompted federal police and prosecutors to investigate whether Rio's water utility Cedae is committing environmental crimes by lying about how much sewage it treats. Investigators are also looking into where billions of dollars in funds went since the early 1990s, money earmarked to improve sewage services and clean Guanabara Bay.

Cedae has denied any wrongdoing. It said in an emailed statement that any super bacteria found at the beaches or the Olympic lagoon must be the result of illegal dumping into storm drains. Cedae said it carries out sewage treatment and collection in the entire "south zone" of Rio, where the bodies of water are located and where the water samples were taken.

'Like candy'

Five scientists consulted by Reuters said the immediate risk to people's health when faced with super bacteria infection depends on the state of their immune systems.

These bacteria are opportunistic microbes that can enter the body, lie dormant, then attack at a later date when a healthy person may fall ill for another reason. Super bacteria infect not only humans but also otherwise-harmless bacteria present in the waters, turning them into antibiotic-resistant germs.

Harwood said the super bacteria genes discovered in the Olympic lagoon were probably not harmful if swallowed by themselves: they need to be cocooned inside of a bacterium. "Those genes are like candy. They are organic molecules and they'll be eaten up by other bacteria, other organisms," Harwood said. "That's where the danger is - if a person then ingests that infected organism - because it will make it through their gastrointestinal tract and potentially make someone ill."

The presence of the super bacteria genes in the lagoon indicates the bacteria themselves had recently died or simply were not detected by testing, Harwood said. Health experts say Rio's poor wastewater management has already created endemic illnesses associated with sewage that disproportionately impact the city's poor, including gastrointestinal and respiratory problems, Hepatitis A and severe heart and brain conditions. — Reuters







ellowstone National Park is a national park located primarily in the US state of Wyoming, although it also extends into Montana and Idaho. It was established by the US Congress and signed into law by President Ulysses S. Grant on March 1, 1872. Yellowstone, the first National Park in the US and widely held to be the first national park in the world, is known for its wildlife and its many geothermal features, especially Old Faithful Geyser, one of the most popular features in the park. It has many types of ecosystems, but the subalpine forest is the most abundant. It is part of the South Central Rockies forests ecoregion.

Native Americans have lived in the Yellowstone region for at least 11,000 years. Aside from visits by mountain men during the early-to-mid-19th century, organized exploration did not begin until the late 1860s. Hundreds of structures have been built and are protected for their architectural and historical significance, and researchers have examined more than 1,000 archaeological sites.

Biology and ecology

Yellowstone National Park spans an area of 3,468.4 square miles, comprising lakes, canyons, rivers and mountain ranges. Yellowstone Lake is one of the largest high-elevation lakes in North America and is centered over the Yellowstone Caldera, the largest 'supervolcano' on the continent. The caldera is considered an active volcano. It has erupted with tremendous force several times in the last two million years. Half of the world's geothermal features are in Yellowstone, fueled by this ongoing volcanism. Lava flows and rocks from volcanic eruptions cover most of the land area of Yellowstone.

The park is the centerpiece of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, the largest remaining nearly-intact ecosystem in the Earth's northern temperate zone.

Hundreds of species of mammals, birds, fish and reptiles have been documented, including several that are either endangered or threatened. The vast forests and grasslands also include unique species of plants. Yellowstone Park is the largest and most famous mega fauna location in the Continental United States. Grizzly bears, wolves, and free-ranging herds of bison and elk live in the park. The Yellowstone Park bison herd is the oldest and largest public bison herd in the United States. Forest fires occur in the park each year; in the large forest fires of 1988, nearly one third of the park was burnt. Yellowstone has numerous recreational opportunities, including hiking, camping, boating, fishing and sightseeing. Paved roads provide close access to the major geothermal areas as well as some of the lakes and waterfalls. During the winter, visitors often access the park by way of guided tours that use either snow coaches or snowmobiles.

Grand Prismatic Spring

The Grand Prismatic Spring in Yellowstone National Park is the largest hot spring in the United States, and the third largest in the world, after Frying Pan Lake in New Zealand and Boiling Lake in Dominica. It is located in the Midway Geyser Basin.

Grand Prismatic Spring was noted by geologists working in the Hayden Geological Survey of 1871, and named by them for its striking coloration. Its colors match the rainbow dispersion of white light by an optical prism: red, orange, yellow, green, and blue.







The 57-year-old talk show host is proud that her self-titled daytime program is deliberately uplifting as she has never found humor in poking fun at other people's expense, because she knows first-hand how painful that can be. She said: "It is a happy show, on purpose. I represent happiness to a lot people... "[As a child,] I was very tender, very sensitive, and I still am. I never want to hurt anybody. I want to make people laugh. I didn't think it was ever funny to make fun of people. There's so much to laugh at without it being at someone else's expense." Ellen came out as a lesbian in April 1997 and is an outspoken advocate for gay rights. 


Sykes 'doesn't fancy' Grande



"I'm terribly pleased and relieved with the verdict," the film's director Abhishek Chaubey told reporters outside court, adding that he hoped it would force the board to change its approach. Several Bollywood actors and directors praised the court's decision. "Landmark judgment by the honorable Bombay High Court on #UdtaPunjab. Great victory for the filmmakers," Madhur Bhandarkar, a filmmaker himself, wrote on Twitter. "Thank U Judiciary for giving back the makers of Indian Cinema their right to express," tweeted filmmaker and dissenting CBFC board member Ashoke Pandit. "Udta Punjab" stars Kareena Kapoor, Alia Bhatt and Shahid Kapoor. — AFP

McKellen brings 'Shakespeare

on Film' collection to Shanghai

eteran actor lan McKellen brought celebrations mark-ing 400 years since William Shakespeare's death to Shanghai yesterday, launching the British Film Institute's "Shakespeare on Film" collection of movies in the Chinese city. The program, which is touring countries around the world this year to mark Shakespeare's April 23, 1616 death, features screenings of film adaptations of the playwright's

Renny Harlin to shoot 'Legend of the Ancient Sword' for Alibaba

op action film director Renny Harlin is to make Chineselanguage action fantasy film "Legend of the Ancient Sword" as his next picture. Production and Chinese distribution is through Alibaba Pictures Group, the film making arm of Chinese e-commerce giant Alibaba. The film is already in pre-production ahead of principal photography that is scheduled to start in October. The film is derived from a 3D role playing video game originally developed by Shanghai Aurogon and published in 2010 by Gamebar. A TV series was previously produced.

Alibaba purchased rights to the second game and has plans to turn it into both a TV series and a possible three movie series. Harlin is connected only with the feature movies. Alibaba Pictures did not disclose the budget but described the film as "substantial by Chinese standards." It likened the project to the "Harry Potter" franchise. "This is a big, epic fantasy adventure," Harlin told Variety. "My ambition is to integrate this Chinese property with Hollywood storytelling and visual effects and to introduce new fighting techniques." Harlin recently completed the Jackie Chan-starring action adventure "Skiptrace," which will be released in Chinese theaters on July 22. — Reuters



'HAMILTON' WINS BIG AT TONYS BUT FAILS TO BREAK RECORD

amilton," the hip-hop stage biography of Alexander Hamilton, won the 2016 Tony Award for best new musical, capping an emotional night in which many in the Broadway community rallied to embrace the LGBT community after a shooting at a gay Florida nightclub. Lin-Manuel Miranda's hip-hop-flavored biography about the first US treasury secretary won 11 Tonys, just short of breaking the 12-Tony record held by "The Producers."

Jeffrey Seller, producer of "Hamilton," quoted the show's lyrics when accepting the award. "Look around, look around. How lucky we are to be alive right now," he said. "Hamilton" went into the night with 16 nominations and, in addition to taking the musical award, won best score, best book, direction, orchestration, choreography and best featured actor and actress statuettes for Renee Elise Goldsberry and Daveed Diggs. Leslie Odom Jr, who plays Aaron Burr, won best actor and thanks Miranda for "a new vision of what's possible." He thanked his wife, actress Nicolette Robinson and his parents.

The show earlier won awards for costume and lighting but lost scenic design to "She Loves Me," meaning "Hamilton" couldn't break the 12-statuette record haul by "The Producers." Still, few shows get introduced by a sitting president, as Barack and Michelle Obama did for the performance by the show's cast. The awards show unspooled with a heavy heart a night after a gunman killed 50 people at a gay Florida nightclub, prompting a Broadway tribute to the victims at the top of the show and a smattering of references to tolerance throughout it.



Host James Corden, his back to the audience, spoke to viewers when he dedicated the night to celebrating the diversity of Broadway. "Hate will never win. Together we have to make sure of that. Tonight's show stands as a symbol and a celebration of that principle," he said. But for much of the telecast, the mood was light and typical of an awards show. Miranda, the star and creator of "Hamilton," won for best score and book, and read from onstage a sonnet, referencing tragedy and urging "love and love and love..." Thomas Kail won the Tony for directing "Hamilton." He thanked Miranda, a frequent collaborator, and celebrated the diversity of Broadway this season. "Let's continue to tell stories," he said.

English actress Cynthia Erivo won the Tony for best actress for her Broadway debut in "The Color Purple." She thanked her cast for "making me a stronger woman on that stage." Her show, which failed to beat "Jersey Boys" for the best musical Tony Award in 2006, won the best musical revival award in 2016. Jayne Houdyshell, a mainstay of the New York stage, won her first Tony Award at 62 for playing a gossipy, gently needling mom in "The Humans." Her stage husband, Reed Birney, won best featured actor in a play. An actor for almost 42 years, he acknowledged that 35 of them were "pretty bad." He thanked the theater community for keeping him going.

The play, about a fractious family's get-together, won the best play statuette and playwright Stephen Karam dedicated his award to all the struggling writers. "Keep the faith," he said. In response to the shooting Sunday that left at least 50 people dead in a crowded nightclub in Orlando, Florida, "Hamilton" dropped its use of muskets in its performance. Many stars also wore a silver ribbon to show solidarity. "My heart is saddened by it," Seller said on the red carpet before the show. "The celebration tonight is tempered by it."

The shooting was close to home for Christopher Fitzgerald, who was nominated for his role in "Waitress" and went to school in Orlando. "I'm heartbroken. I think everybody is feeling it, so we are at least all coming together to celebrate and not live in fear," he said on the carpet. Jessica Lange won her first Tony for playing a drug-addled mother in the revival of the monumental "Long Day's Journey Into Night." The two-time Academy Award

Under his helm, the barefoot cast warily circled one another under bright lights in a set that resembled a boxing ring. The show was also named best play revival. The show opened with the cast of "Hamilton" performing their opening number with the lyrics altered to have them all wondering why Corden -"chatting with Hollywood phonies" - had earned the honor of hosting the show.

At another: "Think of tonight as the Oscars, but with diversity," and made a dig at Donald Trump for wanting to build a wall around the theater. He later flirted with Oprah Winfrey. Donald Trump was a frequent target. Nathan Lane made a crack about Trump University and Emilio Estefan insisted that his all-Latin cast for "On Your Feet!" were all in the US legally.

Corden at one point suggested there were so many diverse performers on the show that the Republican candidate would want to put a wall around the theater. There was also a joke about Trump starring in "The Book of Moron." To be fair, Glenn Close mocked Hillary Clinton in the fictional show "A Clinton Line." "Hamilton" and the 38 new productions this season helped Broadway's attendance figures hit a record high, up 1.6 percent to 13.3 million ticket buyers. The season also was rich in diversity among actors: Fourteen of the 40 Tony nominees for acting in plays and musicals - or 35 percent - were actors of color. — AP





Bloodless bullfights earn Gulf owners big bucks

in the Gulf emirate of Fujairah, but a winning beast in the by a committee of judges formed of eight local elders. popular sport can still earn its owner a fortune. Bullfights weekly event at a ring close to the beach on the east coast of the United Arab Emirates. Organizers admit the sport is rough but insist it is animal-friendly, and they ensure the bull is never killed. While it's believed 16th century Portuguese invaders introduced bullfighting to the Gulf, Fujairah's version pits two bulls against one another instead of man against beast.

And unlike at bull-on-bull tournaments in Southeast Asia, spectators place no bets-Islamic tradition and Emirati laws for-

here's no matador, betting or blood when bulls lock horns hours-long contest. The winning bull in each round is decided

There are no cash prizes for the owners. But the value of a winning bull can shoot up in price, attracting offers by traders. some of whom drive in from nearby Oman where the sport is even more popular. "When a bull is always distinct-winning against other bulls-its price can reach 600,000 dirhams (\$163,000)," said Hamad Al-Matrushi, an elderly committee member and bull-owner. "But the price of a bull which sometimes performs well and other times not so well would go down to around 120,000 (\$32,700) or 80,000 dirhams (\$21,800),"



bid it. A fight lasts just minutes, ending when one of the bulls gives up or is pushed back by its rival to the roar of a commentator's voice over loudspeakers. Upon his word, more than a dozen barefooted handlers use ropes to pull the bulls apart before the next bout kicks off.

"Dr Thomas and Jackson," says the commentator, introducing the next pair of animals to lock horns. As the two bulls square off, an alarm pierces the air. Known as "Al-wannan", the sound is intended as a form of applause to heighten the excitement. Despite soaring temperatures, local families and tourists gather around the fenced bull-ring. Some sit atop SUVs, cracking seeds and sipping juice. Around 80 bulls take part in the

'Merciful' tradition

This form of bullfighting, known in Arabic as munatahat Al-Thiran (bull-butting), has its own set of traditions. The brightlycoloured "traje de luces" (suit of lights) clothing that distinguishes Spanish matadors is replaced by the traditional white robe worn by Bedouins, known locally as the dishdasha. Twelve-year-old Swati, an Indian girl who came with her family from the modern city-state of Dubai, was expecting to see a matador waving a red cape. "But when I came here, my father told me that it's actually two bulls fighting," she said.

Matrushi pointed to another difference with the Spanish version. "There, they could mistreat the animal or torture it.

Here we are merciful towards it. We provide it with medical treatment, we take care of it and feed it properly." Mohammed Abdullah, a 30-year-old government employee who himself owns 15 bulls, agreed, "We give them food and nourishment from the best types of proteins and vitamins," he said. He estimated that feeding his bulls costs him 10,000 dirhams (\$2,700) a month. There is no system of weight classes for the bulls, which can fight from the age of two until they retire to the fields or are given away as gifts.

The Jersey and Holstein breeds are the most popular. Fujairah's champion is named Reyla, a massive black hulk of flesh. It always wins, attracting fans who cross the border from Oman to watch it fight. "It comes with its own audience," said Abdullah. The owner has been offered 300,000 dirhams (\$81,700) in cash and still refuses to sell.

'Barbarism'

From an early age, owners can tell if a calf will grow up to be successful in the ring. Potential fighters are trained by walking them in the sea to strengthen the legs, before they are taken to the mountains to build up chest muscles. Matrushi said a farmer can often "provide the bulls with more attention than that he gives to his own children". But Mimi Bekhechi, director of the animal rights organization PETA UK, remains unimpressed. "This ridiculous and inhumane form of human entertainment can only be distressing to bulls, who will be agitated by the noise of the crowd and from being manhandled," she

"These days, we should be past such barbarism," Bekhechi said. Ethiopian tourist Kidani agreed. "It's not right, because they hurt each other," he said. The organizers "make the animals very angry." The nearby bulls bellowed and snorted, dragging their hooves in the sand. As the sun set, they were dragged into pick-ups and driven back to nearby farms. — AFP
