# LOW OIL PRICES PUT STRAINS ON CURRENCY PEGS

**KUWAIT:** Weak oil prices pose a threat to Gulf Arab states' currency pegs against the dollar, but the energy-rich region is unlikely to abandon the policy yet, analysts say. Bahrain, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates all keep the values of their currencies fixed against the greenback, while Kuwait has a link to a basket of currencies including the dollar. But doubts are growing about whether the policy still makes sense.

The slide in oil prices has battered the economies of the six Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) member states at a time when an improving American economy and prospects of higher US interest rates are lifting the dollar. To maintain the currency pegs, all GCC members except Qatar

**KUWAIT:** HH the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah told MPs yesterday that planned government measures to reduce subsidies will not undermine the income of Kuwaiti citizens but are aimed at countering the existing financial situation. He also told members of three National Assembly panels, including the financial and economic affairs committee, that subsidies will be made available to all sections of the society and those who want to consume more will have to pay the cost of this extra consumption, MP Abdulrahman Al-Jeeran cited the Amir as saying. The Amir also said this does not represent anything beyond the capability of citizens.

Head of the Assembly's priority issues committee MP Yousef Al-Zalzalah said the Amir analyzed the financial situation in the country and provided solutions for the issues. Zalzalah said the Amir assured MPs that the government will continue to provide services to citizens and ensure they continue to live a dignified life. The Amir also called on the Assembly and the government to cooperate to overcome the current financial situation, adding that Kuwait will be capable to do this if available resources are utilized in the best way.

# GULF OIL SQUEEZE SPREADS TO BANKS

**DUBAI/DOHA:** Low oil prices are forcing Gulf states to borrow to prop up their economies and are now taking their toll on the region's banks too, complicating their efforts to raise capital required by regulators. The impact of crude's fall from more than \$100 to below \$30 a barrel in less than 18 months has already been felt by oil and gas revenue dependent Middle Eastern countries which have had to borrow to prop up their economies. And international investors have been avoiding the Gulf region's debt in recent months as a result, concerned about slower economic growth and substantial budget deficits.

This has had a knock-on effect on banks from Doha to Muscat, with the ensuing slump in stock prices and bond market volatility making it impossible for them to raise new capital so far this year, a situation which is unlikely to ease in the near future as they will have to compete with governments needing to borrow billions of dollars to pay their bills. A dozen of the region's banks have announced capital raising plans as they try to meet local regulatory requirements, which in some cases are above the levels set by the Basel III banking accord, and top up reserves after years of lending growth.

These plans are now on ice and Gulf banks have to decide whether to attempt to borrow at a higher cost or hold out and risk falling short of more stringent regulatory requirements, which come into force over the next three years. Another potential complication is that the flight of international buyers means banks will have to turn to local investors to buy their debt or equity. The problem here is that banks themselves are the largest regional debt investors.

# FORMER US FIRST LADY NANCY REAGAN DIES

LOS ANGELES: Nancy Reagan, the former actress who was fiercely protective of husband Ronald Reagan through a Hollywood career, eight years in the White House, an assassination attempt and her husband's Alzheimer's disease, died yesterday at age 94, the Reagan library said. Michael Reagan said on Twitter he was saddened by his stepmother's death. "She is once again with the man she loved," he wrote. Reagan became one of the most influential first ladies in US history during her Republican husband's presidency from 1981 to 1989.

Her husband, who affectionately called her "Mommy" while she called him "Ronnie", died in 2004 after a long struggle with Alzheimer's, the progressive brain disorder that destroys memory. As Nancy Davis, she was a Hollywood actress during the 1940s

and 1950s and married Reagan, a prominent film actor, in 1952. She then served as first lady of California during her husband's stint as California governor from 1967 to 1975 before moving into the White House after his decisive victory over incumbent Democratic President Jimmy Carter in 1980.

**KUWAIT:** State-run Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) has signed a memorandum of understanding with the Pakistani Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Resources (MPNR) for developing oil wells in the south Asian country. In a press statement, the KPC said that the MoU would be implemented through its foreign subsidiary Kuwait Foreign Petroleum Exploration Company (KUF-PEC).

It noted that the MoU was signed yesterday during Pakistani Minister of Petroleum and Natural Resources Shahid Khaqan Abbasi's visit to KPC headquarters. Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Finance, Acting Minister of Oil and Board Chairman of KPC Anas Al-Saleh received the Pakistani minister at the KPC premises and held bilateral talks over means to strengthen ties and upgrade cooperation, it said.

The statement pointed out that KUFPEC has been working in Pakistan for over 25 years and has invested more than \$1 billion in a number of operating licenses in the southeastern Sindh province. It noted that KUFPEC operates the Jati Exploration Block in Sindh and recently won a contract to explore for oil in the Paharpur Block in the northern part of the country.

KUFPEC, a subsidiary of KPC, is an international oil company engaged in the exploration, development and production of crude oil and natural gas outside Kuwait. It is currently active in 15 countries worldwide with 63 oil and gas projects across Asia, Africa, Australia, Europe and North America. — KUNA



# PALESTINIAN FM EXTOLLS AMIR'S CONTINUED SUPPORT

JAKARTA: Palestine's Foreign Minister Riyad al-Maliki described His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah as a man of noble actions, underscoring his continued support of the Palestinian cause.

"His Highness the Amir's support of Palestine remains persistent," Maliki said during a preparatory ministerial meeting for the fifth extraordinary session of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) in the Indonesian capital Jakarta.

"Kuwait has never ceased, not even for a day, to support Palestine," Maliki said. "Palestine efforts to protect the holy Al-Aqsa mosque from Israeli aggressions," he noted. "We are not here to discuss a peace plan, but a way of safeguarding the holy Al-Aqsa mosque. A peace plan could be discussed during a forthcoming OIC session slated to take place in Istanbul," the Palestinian foreign minister said. This meeting has one aim, which is to "spur all Muslims into action to protect the holy Al-Aqsa mosque," he said.

The meeting kicked off yesterday focusing on Palestine and Jerusalem. Kuwait is participating in the meeting with a delegation led by Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Mohammad needs to be supported by joint Arab and Islamic Abduallah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah. The delegation

also includes Kuwait's Consul General in Jeddah Saleh Al-Saqabi, Deputy Assistant Foreign Minister for International Organizations' Affairs Nasser Al-Hein and Kuwait's Ambassador to Indonesia Abdulwahab Al-Saqer.

Senior officials held earlier yesterday a closed preparatory meeting headed by Indonesian Deputy Foreign Minister for multilateral affairs Hassan Kulaib, as well as Kuwaiti Deputy Assistant Forging Minister for International Organizations Ambassador Nasser Al-Hein. They tackled potential draft resolutions and Jakarta draft declaration to be referred to the ministerial meeting. — KUNA

# **JUSTICE MINISTER LAUNCHES** FIRST PHASE OF ELECTRONIC ANNOUNCEMENT SYSTEM

**KUWAIT:** Minister of Justice and Minister of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs Yaqoub Al-Sane launched yesterday the first phase of an electronic announcement system for government transactions, in conjunction with the Department of Fatwa and Legislation. Speaking at an initiation ceremony, Sane said that he had set a motto of "prompt justice" upon taking the helm of the Ministry of Justice.

The first step is to amend Law 26/2015, which deals with civil and commercial cases in a way that "adapts to technological advances by overcoming any impediments to a more efficient judicial system," Sane said. "We as a nation will not prosper until we embrace the latest technological

means," he noted. "This system will spare us time and effort and lead to a smoother judicial process," Sane added. The Minister also revealed that the Ministry has signed a contract with courier company Express Post, after amending Law 26/2015. The company would be tasked with delivering recorded messages pertinent to judicial cases, to various destinations no later than 72 hours after receiving the messages.

Head of the Fatwa and Legislation Department Salah Al-Masaad said that he is proud that the department was the first to initiate the new electronic system. "This system propels us towards a world of technology and civilization," Masaad said. — KUNA

# **WORK-RELATED INJURIES**

s I have previously mentioned in my articles, the majority of the questions I receive are regarding work-related concerns. It is also clear and evident to me that the law is unfortunately not easily accessible by the majority of the people living in

I have received a very important question this week concerning a work-related injury that I have decided to share with you:

Firstly, I want to thank you for making the legislations in Kuwait more accessible and understandable to us expats, as I am sure a lot of people would find this information extremely helpful. There isn't enough information online about labor laws in Kuwait to empower the people that work in Kuwait, specifically

The reason I'm emailing you is because I want to get some preliminary advice regarding a scenario a friend of mine was involved in, who is a hardworking expat. My friend had a work-related injury where he was badly injured and therefore has been temporarily disabled and will be out of work for a period of probably three

Initially, the employee was given friendly advice from lawyer friends regarding compensation that would be settled by the courts of a rough estimate of about KD 15,000-30,000. The compensation/settlement was assumed to be coming from a third party company. This company helped set up equipment that led to the injury. My questions are:

### Compensation

Question: What is the expectation here in terms of compensation? Who compensates the employee who sustained a very serious injury at work?"

Fajer: Before answering your question, I would like to make one thing clear to my readers and clients. I do not answer questions asked on behalf of another client. In order for my answer to be legally accurate, I would need to speak to the person concerned. With that said, I will answer your questions generally and not specifically but would require your friend to contact me personally, and I assure you all will be confidential.

It is not for a lawyer to answer this question! The compensation amount is calculated by an expert hired by the court and therefore lawyers are not qualified to answer this question. With that said though, there is a law that states the amounts to be compensated for each body part injured.

According to the decree on the regulation of blood money (Diyah), loss of eyesight (even in one eye only) is compensated by KD 10,000, loss of hearing (even in one ear only) is compensated by KD 10,000, loss of one hand is compensated by KD 5,000, loss of one leg is compensated by KD 5,000, loss of thumb is compensated by KD 1,500, disjoint of bones is compensated by KD 1,500, and a scar is compensated by KD 500.

These figures are for injuries that were by accident and are not directly because of your friend's acts. For example, if an employee is obligated to wear head protection while working as per his company's policies or rules and regulations, yet the employee does not abide with this, then the employee is responsible for any injuries that may occur due to his carelessness.

# Negotiation

Question: Is this something that is done through the court or can this be settled outside the courts? And if so, how long is this process?

Fajer: It can be settled by negotiation or by court, and honestly it is better for both parties to negotiate amicably to agree to an amount outside of court. Going to court will cost both parties legal fees as well as time and may butcher the relationship between the employee and the employer. Taking the matter to court will initially take around 8 months minimum and could

# **Estimation**

Question: The employer has offered KD 3,000 in cash (half a year's worth of salary) with no salary for the time that is taken away from work and the employee is expected to be possibly out of work for 3-4 months? This does not sound correct to me what do you think?

Fajer: As I have mentioned above, it is not for me or any other lawyer to estimate and since I do not even know what your friend's injury is exactly, I cannot make any assumptions. Your friend should be compensated for the months he is off as this should be a medical leave (just as long as it does not turn into a permanent disability). I am assuming here as well that your friend works in the private sector.

I hope your friend has a quick recovery and I hope that his or her employer compensates him fairly. Thank you for emailing me and your kind words, and I hope you find the above helpful.

# MP SLAMS FIREWORKS SHOW HELD DESPITE BUDGET DEFICIT

KUWAIT: MP Hamdan Al-Azmi strongly criticized the government's performance in handling the current deficit, attributing it to the government's mismanagement. "How can the government convince citizens to rationalize and cut expenses while it continues to waste and squander public funds?" he wondered, noting that at the same time, millions had been spent on the recent fireworks show at Kuwait Towers. Accordingly, Azmi filed a parliamentary enquiry with Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammed Al-Abdullah about the total cost of the fireworks festivity and the company that executed it.

### Suspect released

A court yesterday released a Syrian man who had been arrested for forging Kuwaiti citizenship on KD 2,000 bail and banned him from leaving the country. Notably, the man is accused of paying a citizen KD 20,000 to register his son under his name so that he could get Kuwaiti citizenship.

### **Canceled scholarships**

The Civil Services Commission (CSC) said that the total number of scholarships cancelled because of violating scholarship rules was 100 in addition to cancelling 150 study leaves to resume university studies. CSC added that the total number of students dispatched on local and overseas scholarships was 1,500 in addition to 3,750 employees on study leaves. CSC also explained that the new fiscal year included increasing the monthly allowance of non-medical students by KD 100 to become KD 400 for students studying in Europe and KD 340 for students studying in Arab countries, in addition to annual flight tickets (instead of every two years), doubling the annual books allowance to become KD 200 and KD 300 and increasing scientific research allowance for medical students to KD 800 instead of KD 600.

## **Expiry dates**

The Ministry of Commerce and Industry is currently preparing the draft of a ministerial decision to requ-

late print presses' work in a way that prevents forging expiry dates on various products. According to the new decision, print presses will not be allowed to print production and expiry date stickers without prior permission from relevant authorities at the commerce ministry. The decision will also subject any violating presses to penalties that may reach as far as closure.

### **Municipality staff**

Kuwait Municipality stressed that it is currently reassessing the performance of its employees by measuring each individual employee's productivity. The municipality added that employees and directors would be reshuffled for the greater good and that their IDs would be connected to GPS systems to locate their whereabouts during working hours.

### **Visiting professor**

University of South California (USC) in Los Angeles recently selected Kuwait University (KU) urology professor Dr Ahmed Al-Kandari as a distinguished visiting professor to teach in

He has been invited to many American and Canadian medical centers. He recently met USC's assistant dean while attending the first medical conference held by USC's urology

# COUNCILOR SAYS GOVT 'LYING' ABOUT LIFTING SUBSIDIES By Meshaal Al-Enezi explained.

KUWAIT: Municipal Council member Ahmed Al-Bughaili slammed the government's performance and said that the government was lying to citizens about lifting fuel and electricity subsidies and repeatedly using the term 'citizens with limited income.' "We

do not know how the government classifies citizens and who gets limited income according to it," he stressed, noting the fact that the government only resorted to one option - lifting subsidies - to handle deficits resulting from dropping oil prices emphasizes that the government is lying.

"The government has approved petrol prices at 65 fils per liter. Taking into consideration that oil prices now have reached \$25 per barrel, simple calculations show that the actual cost of petrol is 47 fils per liter, in addition to 16 fils for refining, distribution and other costs, adding up the total per liter cost to 63 fils, which means the government will not pay any subsidies, and even make two fils profit per liter," he

### **Rumors denied**

The Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor (MSAL) has strongly denied social media rumors about subjecting girls in the ministry's care houses to pressure to willingly leave the houses. Public Relations Director Afifa Akbar said that MSAL's family care department works relentlessly to make care home tenants comfortable and that KD 13,000 has been allocated for each of them once they turn 18. She added that other services provided included vehicles and drivers, trips to chalets, laundry services and pocket money depending on which stage they are studying in.

The criminal court yesterday adjourned the 'Fintas Group' case until March 14 to summon the criminal evidence officer for testimony.

# POLICE FOIL ATTEMPT TO SMUGGLE DRUGS INTO JAIL




# **ECLIPSE TO BE SEEN** IN PACIFIC

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# KUWAIT'S EXPORTS DOWN to KD 3.5 billion in Q4

**KUWAIT:** Kuwait's exports fell by 37.6 percent to KD 3.5 billion in the fourth quarter of 2015, compared with the same period of the previous year, the Central Statistical Bureau said yesterday. Kuwait's imports, comparatively, amounted to KD 2.4 billion in the period from October to December 2015, up 7.7 percent over the same period of 2014, the bureau added. Trade balance made a surplus of KD 1.04 billion in the fourth quarter of 2015, compared with KD 3.3 billion in the same period of 2014, down 68.7 percent, it

main partner country for non-oil exports was Saudi Arabia with KD 60.4 million. For exports, Saudi Arabia was followed by India with KD 60 million and UAE with KD 58 million, it said. The top country for Kuwait's imports was China (KD 374 million), records for imports range from UAE (KD 223.3 million), the US (KD 214.6 million), and Japan (KD 204.1 million), it added.

As compared with the same quarter of the previous year, exports to the GCC countries were KD 152.3 million, increased by 16.8 percent. The share

# HOW TO DESTROY TRUMP?



ver since he started his presidential election campaign, candidate Donald Trump has been antagonizing everybody, while presidential candidates usually try to befriend everybody and claim that everybody supports him. # OVER 25% EXPATS WORK AS DOMESTIC LABORERS

# 73% of citizens work in offices, security, education

**KUWAIT:** Recent government statistics showed that the total number of workers in Kuwait's labor market is 2.574 million working in three major sectors - the public sector, private sector and domestic laborers. Statistics also highlighted that 26.4 percent of expats working in Kuwait are domestic laborers, 26 percent work as laborers and 14.64 percent work as drivers and automotive and heavy machinery technicians, Al-Qabas reported.

Statistics collected until Dec 31, 2015 also showed that the total number of expats working in Kuwait is 2.138 million compared to only 435,000 Kuwaitis, ie only 17 percent of the total manpower, while expats form 83 percent. In addition, statistics showed that 73 percent of Kuwaitis mainly worked in three fields: 35 percent in offices, 23 percent doing technical jobs and 15 percent of the total manpower in security-related jobs. The study also showed that 9,500 Kuwaitis work as executives (2.2 percent) in both the public and private sectors.

Furthermore, the statistics showed that Kuwaitis outside the labor market reach 389,000, retired citizens 92,300 and Kuwaiti

housewives 73,411. On the other hand, statistics showed that expats outside the labor market reach 371,000 including 733 seniors sponsored by their children, 207,000 housewives and 163,000 young people aged 15 and above.

# **Five domestic workers**

In other news, Al-Anbaa reported that in a bid to fight the soaring fees of recruiting domestic laborers which reached up to KD 1,400, the interior ministry's visa affairs director Maj Gen Talal Maarafi issued a directive limiting the total number of domestic labor visas a citizen can issue every year to five only. The measure also helps fight human trafficking, especially as some sponsors tend to bring in many workers and then relinquish their sponsorship to the highest bidder.

# **Educational institutes**

Meanwhile, the Manpower Public Authority (MPA) has allowed the issuance of work visas for jobs in universities and education institutes without limiting them to educational jobs, in addition to bringing in workers for home med-



### Partygoers assault police in Reqqa

KUWAIT: Policemen received a call about reckless driving in Regga near a multipurpose hall, where a wedding party was going on. Ahmadi police rushed to the area, blocked the suspects and asked them to pull to the side of the road, but policemen were surprised by tens of people coming out of the hall, hindering police work, and attacking two of them. Backup patrols were called in to deal with the situation, and rounds were fired in the air to disperse the crowd who attacked the policemen. Four suspects were arrested, while many escaped.

## **Drug possession**

Southern roads security arrested a drug user on Nuwaiseeb road with various types of drugs including 14 heroin joints, 26 hashish pieces as well as an envelope containing what is suspected to be drugs. He was sent to the Drugs Control General Department.

### **Domestic violence**

Two citizens accused their brother of beating their mother and sisters in their Salmiya home, while the accused claimed that his family wants to take his money. The case was sent to investigations.

# CUSTOMS, UNION **CLASH OVER APPOINTMENTS**

**KUWAIT:** A crisis of noncooperation between the customs department and its workers union is poised to head the labor union scene once again in the coming days, as the latter had reservations on the decision to appoint deputies of the general manager as one of them is from outside the customs department. They considered that the appointment did not take the union's view, which is strict in applying "justice and equality" principles.

Head of the Customs Union Ahmad Al-Enezi said its workers have the scientific competence and experience that excludes the need of appointing a deputy director general from outside the customs establishment, especially since this prestigious position is longed for by workers. Enezi said non-consideration of civil service rules in appointing senior officials will remove trust and communications between employees and their administrations, especially since the nomination is in violation of the rules that calls upon the finance minister to name three names for each leadership position, and the Civil Service Commission chooses one.

Enezi said appointments do not take seniority and experience into consideration and may open the door for contestation at the administrative court, and appointment of leaders in this un-institutional fashion, despite the presence of competent personal, raised many questions. Enezi said the customs workers union will have a clear stand in not accepting appointments from outside the customs, and may lead to tension in the relationship between customs officers and Finance Minister Anas Al-Saleh, who "we are looking forward to deal and coordinate with in the interest of employees."



# CRUZ, TRUMP SPLIT FOUR STATES

# SANDERS WINS TWO STATES, CLINTON ONE • RUBIO URGED TO DROP OUT

hopeful Ted Cruz split victories in four nominating contests with frontrunner Donald Trump yesterday, bolstering Cruz's argument that he represents the party's best chance to stop the brash New York billionaire. The results were a repudiation of a Republican establishment that has bristled at the prospect of either Cruz or Trump winning the party's nomination and has largely lined up behind US Senator Marco Rubio of Florida, who was shut out in all four contests. "I think it's time that he dropped out of the race," Trump said of Rubio after the contests. "I want Ted one on one."

Cruz won Kansas and Maine on Saturday, while Trump won the bigger states of Louisiana and Kentucky, holding onto his lead in the race for the Republican nomination for the Nov 8 presidential election, even though Cruz captured more delegates on Saturday. The next big contest, and a crucial one, will be tomorrow's primary in the industrial state of Michigan. Republicans in three other states, Mississippi, Idaho and Hawaii, also will vote on Tuesday. Puerto Rico Republicans will vote on Sunday.

In the Democratic race, front-runner

**WASHINGTON:** Republican presidential Hillary Clinton won in Louisiana, and her Trump, said the results showed he was gainrival Bernie Sanders, a US senator from Vermont, won in Kansas and Nebraska, in results that did not substantially change Clinton's big delegate lead. Mainstream Republicans have blanched at Trump's calls to build a wall on the border with Mexico, round up and deport 11 million undocumented immigrants and temporarily bar all Muslims from entering the United States. But the party's establishment has not been much happier with Cruz, who has alienated many party leaders in Washington. "It looks like it will be the angry Trump voters against the purist conservative Cruz voters," said Washington-based Republican strategist Ron Bonjean. "The establishment is just being left out."

A spokesman for Rubio, who spent the past week launching harsh personal attacks on Trump, said the senator would push on with an eye on the March 15 contest in Florida. "After we win the Florida primary, the map, the momentum and the money is going to be on our side," spokesman Alex Conant said in a statement. Cruz, a first-term US senator from Texas who has promoted himself as more of a true conservative than

ing momentum in the race to catch the real estate mogul.

Cruz, 45, has run as an outsider bent on shaking up the Republican establishment in Washington. A favorite of evangelicals, he has called for the United States to "carpet bomb" the Islamic State militant group and has pledged to eliminate the tax-collecting Internal Revenue Service and four cabinet agencies and to enact a balanced budget amendment.

# 'A Howl from Washington'

"The scream you hear, the howl that comes from Washington, DC, is utter terror at what 'We the People' are doing together," Cruz told supporters in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, after his early win in Kansas. "What we're seeing is the public coming together, libertarians coming together, men and women who love the Constitution coming together and uniting and standing as one behind this campaign," Cruz said.

Trump, 69, has a substantial lead in the delegates needed to secure the nomination at the Republican National Convention, but since winning seven of the 11 contests on

Super Tuesday he has come under withering fire from a Republican establishment worried he will lead the party to defeat in November's election. But endorsements from establishment Republicans have failed to sway voters. Rubio won the backing of Kansas Governor Sam Brownback but still came in third there.

The four Republican contests on Saturday together accounted for just 155 delegates. Cruz won 64 delegates on Saturday, while Trump took 49. The races on Saturday were open only to registered Republicans, excluding the independent and disaffected Democratic voters who have helped Trump's surge to the lead. The anti-Trump forces have a short window to stop the caustic businessman, who ahead of Saturday had accumulated 319 of the 1,237 delegates needed to win the nomination at July's Republican national convention, outpacing Cruz, who had 226 delegates.

On March 15, the delegate-rich states of Florida, Illinois, Ohio, Missouri and North Carolina will vote. Both Florida and Ohio use the winner-take-all method to allocate Republican delegates, making the stakes in those states particularly high. All of the

Republican contests on Saturday, and through March 14, award delegates proportionate to the popular vote, although some states set minimum thresholds to qualify for any delegates. If Trump takes both Florida and Ohio he would be nearly impossible to stop. There are a total of 358 delegates at stake in the five states voting March 15, including 99 in Florida and 66 in Ohio.

On the Democratic side, Clinton has opened up a big delegate lead and Sanders might have a tough time making up the difference. All states in the Democratic race award their delegates proportionally, meaning Clinton can keep piling up delegates even in states she loses. The three states holding Democratic contests on Saturday had a total of 109 delegates at stake. The early estimates were that Clinton, who appeared headed to a smashing nearly 50point win in Louisiana, had won at least 48 delegates on Tuesday and Sanders 37. But Sanders made it clear he was not planning to end his White House guest anytime soon. "We have the momentum. We have a path toward victory. Our campaign is just getting started," he said in a statement after his wins on Saturday. — Reuters

# IS TRUCK BOMB KILLS AT LEAST 60 PEOPLE IN IRAO

HILLA, Iraq: A truck bomb at an Iraqi checkpoint south of Baghdad killed at least 60 people and wounded more than 70 yesterday, medical and security officials said, and Islamic State claimed responsibility for the blast. The suicide attack, involving an explosive-laden fuel tanker, is the second deadliest this year after one on Feb 28 that killed 78 people in Sadr City, a district of Baghdad. This was also claimed by the ultrahardline Sunni group that controls vast swathes of territory in Iraq and in Syria.

The escalation in Islamic State bombings suggests that Iraqi government forces are being stretched thin after their recent gains against the group in the western and northern provinces. Responsibility for the bombing in Hilla, 117 km south of Baghdad, was claimed in a posting on the website of the Amaq news agency,



A provincial hospital official confirmed the number of casualties, adding that 23 of them were members of the police and other security forces that were manning the check point located at the northern entrance of the

# LITTLE TO SHOW FOR IN BOKO HARAM-IS PARTNERSHIP

LAGOS: When Boko Haram pledged allegiance to the Islamic State group in Iraq and Syria last year, there were fears the deadly insurgency in northeast Nigeria would take on an international dimension. The world's deadliest designated terrorist organizations notorious for the indiscriminate slaughter of tens of thousands of people - were now officially linked. Speculation and concern mounted about a potential influx of foreign fighters to the countries surrounding Lake Chad and an escalation of a previously localized conflict.

But 12 months on that hasn't happened. If anything, Boko Haram appears a considerably weaker force and apparently in disarray after a year-long military counter-offensive. Boko Haram leader Abubakar Shekau has only been heard from twice since his audio message published on March 7, 2015 pledging an oath to his IS counterpart Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi. Nigeria's army has since then increasingly claimed crushing blows against the militants and their strongholds plus the liberation of thousands living under Boko Haram control. This week, dozens of rebels reportedly surrendered because of hunger. Nigeria now wants many of the two million people internally displaced by the conflict to return home.

### 'Marketing Label'

Many analysts have long viewed the announced tie-up as propaganda for both sides. Boko Haram was at the time struggling against regional forces and IS suffering setbacks to its territorial ambitions. "Nothing has changed in the Boko Haram camp since Shekau's declaration," Nigerian security analyst Abdullahi Bawa Wase told AFP. "It has failed to bring in IS fighters. It has not attracted IS weapons and cash, which many feared would happen. "On the contrary, Boko Haram is weaker than it was before the declaration, which is evident from the drastic drop in deadly attacks. Even the rate of suicide bombings has slowed."

A Nigerian security source said IS was "only a marketing label which Boko Haram wants to use to deceptively project itself as a formidable terrorist group". Shekau's declaration and the subsequent re-branding of Boko Haram as "Islamic State West Africa Province" or ISWAP caused a reported rift in the Boko Haram hierarchy. Few, if any, wanted to go against his word but dissenters have reportedly explored closer ties with other jihadi groups in the wider Sahel region.

### **Active Threat**

Some security consultants predict Boko Haram in Nigeria could this year be reduced to a largely criminal, regional threat along the lines of the Lord's Resistance Army in central Africa. But with the United States this week including Nigeria on its updated "Worldwide Caution" list, Western governments clearly still view Boko Haram as a serious threat. US military drones recently began operating from a base in northern Cameroon while the Pentagon is considering sending military trainers to northeast Nigeria.

Nigeria's secret police meanwhile announced the arrest of seven members of Ansaru, the Boko Haram offshoot that kidnapped several Westerners and which is more aligned ideologically to Al-Qaeda. The Department of State Services said it had also arrested an IS recruiter, two "ISIS agents operating in Nigeria and the West African sub-region" plus four others heading to join IS. Six of those detained were said to be heading or preparing to go to Libya, where Nigerians are said to be in the IS ranks in territory it controls. Nigeria's President Muhammadu Buhari, who has claimed Boko Haram is "technically" defeated, has increasingly pointed to lawless Libya as a potential security "time bomb" for Europe and Africa.—AFP

# IRAN TYCOON SENTENCED TO DEATH FOR CORRUPTION

# BILLIONAIRE'S TWO ASSOCIATES ALSO CONVICTED

**TEHRAN:** Iran has sentenced billionaire tycoon Babak Zanjani, reportedly one of the country's richest men, to death, convicting him of corruption after a long trial on accusations he fraudulently pocketed \$2.8 billion. A justice official announced the punishment yesterday, noting that Zanjani, who became notorious for finding ways to channel hard currency from oil sales during the sanctions-ridden era of president Mahmoud Ahmadinejad from 2005 to 2013, could appeal.

by managing to subvert the banking restrictions. He said he did so using a web of companies in various countries including the United Arab Emirates, Turkey and Malaysia, selling millions of barrels of Iranian oil.

But he was arrested in Dec 2013, three months after current President Hassan Rouhani took office, having pledged to crack down on corruption. Zanjani, 41, was convicted of fraud and economic crimes and must repay money to the state as well as face the death penalty, judiciary

### 'Corrupt Parasites'

Zanjani told the media that in return for commissions he was tasked with circumventing sanctions to get money back to Iran. He did so at a time of record high oil prices, meaning tens of billions of dollars were at stake. In October last year, however, Rouhani's oil minister Bijan Zanganeh hit out at the use of middlemen such as Zanjani. Iranian media have put the tycoon's fortune as high as \$13.5 billion, with public opinion split on whether he was indeed helping the government or enriching himself at the country's expense. Zanganeh and other officials said the latter was the case.

Speaking after Iran concluded a nuclear deal with world powers in July, paving the way for increased foreign activity in Iran's energy sector, the oil minister urged investors to deal directly with the government and avoid third parties. "We despise the corrupt parasites that want to suck the nation's blood even in this situation," Zanganeh said to loud applause at an industry event in the capital while Zanjani's trial was under way. "I recommend foreign companies stay away from these corrupt individuals" who know nothing but "deceitfulness".

Zanjani was among Iranian individuals blacklisted under US and European sanctions. The nuclear deal saw a large part of these sanctions lifted at the beginning of 2016 in exchange for Tehran curbing its nuclear program. Defending the nuclear talks in 2014 before the deal came about, Rouhani said "a small, fringe group is very angry about it because they will suffer losses" and referred to Zanjani as such a person. In parliamentary elections last month, the president secured his goal of a more moderate parliament, signalling strong public support for the nuclear accord and creating an opening for domestic reforms. As of 2015, Iran ranked first in the world in natural gas reserves and fourth in proven crude oil reserves, according to energy giant

# EGYPT SAYS BROTHERHOOD, HAMAS KILLED PROSECUTOR

CAIRO: Egypt has accused exiled Muslim Brotherhood officials of conspiring with Gazabased Hamas militants to assassinate Public Prosecutor Hisham Barakat last year and arrested 14 people in connection with the attack. Barakat, 64, was killed by a car bomb in Cairo in June 2015. He was the most senior state official assassinated since the toppling in mid-2013 of elected president Mohamed Morsi of the Muslim Brotherhood. There was no claim of responsibility for the attack at the time.

Interior Ministry Magdi Abdel Ghaffar told a news conference that the attack was ordered by Turkey-based leaders of Egypt's oldest Islamist movement and coordinated with Hamas. He accused Hamas of helping to provide training and explosives. He said the authorities had arrested 48 members of a Muslim Brotherhood cell aimed at undermining security through a series of attacks. Fourteen of them had confessed to killing Barakat. "This is a very big conspiracy that started a long time ago and continued," he said.

A judicial source told Reuters on Sunday that six people had been arrested for Barakat's murder. The official MENA news agency reported that those arrested were suspects in several acts of "terrorism, possessing and using explosives, and joining a terrorist group". Judges and other senior officials have been targeted by radical Islamists since then-military chief Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi ousted Morsi after mass protests against his rule.

Sisi, who went on to win a presidential election the next year, banned the Brotherhood and jailed thousands of its followers. Security forces killed hundreds of Mursi supporters in a single day in the bloodiest episode in Egypt's modern history. The Egyptian judiciary says it is independent of the government and military, but some judges have been accused of bias after handing down lengthy jail terms and mass death sen-

The crackdown, which has included restrictions on freedom of protest, has angered many opponents of Sisi who has struggled to suppress an insurgency that is raging in the Sinai Peninsula which borders Hamas-controlled Gaza. The attack last June cast doubt on Egypt's ability to contain an Islamist insurgency based in Sinai that has killed hundreds of policemen and soldiers since Sisi took over. The Brotherhood has been banned and designated as a terrorist organization. The group says it rejects violence. The most active militant group is Sinai Province, which has pledged allegiance to Islamic State, the jihadist group that has seized control of significant areas of Iraq and Syria. —AFP

"We are all trained, qualified and ready for battle. But this force is not enough to retake Mosul," said Iraqi Lt Col Mohammed Al-Wagaa, stationed at Makhmour. "The battle for Mosul is going to take a long time." Under political pressure to show victory, Abadi has repeatedly vowed to "liberate" Mosul this year. But US Lt Gen Vincent Stewart, head of the Defense Intelligence Agency, told Congress last month: "I'm not as optimistic."

Stewart said they may be able to begin "isolation operations" around the city, but "securing or taking Mosul is an extensive operation and not something I see in the next year or so." The Iraqi military's few competent, battle-tested units are scattered, helping to hold various front lines against IS in the country's central and western provinces or tied down controlling cities and towns retaken from the militants since other security forces aren't capable.

Iraq's elite counterterrorism forces have units near Tikrit and Baiji in central Iraq and Habaniya in the west. In Ramadi, capital of the western Anbar province, a counterterrorism commander said his unit has to remain because local police forces can't maintain control. He spoke on condition of anonymity because he's not authorized to talk to the press. "You can't just pick up and leave," Garver said. Without proper forces in place, "Daesh comes back in and seizes terrain that you just spent months taking from them," he said, using an Arabic acronym for IS.

IS has meanwhile stepped up attacks on Baghdad and other towns removed from front-line fighting. Over the past week a double bombing at a market in Baghdad's Sadr City killed more than 70 people. The following day, a suicide attack at a funeral north of Baghdad killed over 30, and on Sunday an explosives-laden fuel truck plowed into a checkpoint south of the capital, killing at least 47 people and wounding dozens. —AP

# ANTI-ERDOGAN PAPER TOES GOVT LINE IN NEW EDITION

**ANKARA:** A leading Turkish newspaper which had staunchly opposed President Recep Tayyip Erdogan printed yesterday its first new edition since its seizure by authorities, strongly supporting the government line. Turkish police on Friday raided the Istanbul premises of the Zaman newspaper using tear gas and water cannon to enter the building in order to impose a court order placing the media business under administration. The front page of the paper, normally strongly critical of the president, on Sunday was

full of articles supporting the government. Zaman headlined an ambitious three billion dollar government project to connect Asian and European sides of Turkey's mega city Istanbul by a third bridge. In common with traditionally progovernment newspapers the front page also contained images of the funerals of "martyrs" killed in the military clashes with Kurdish rebels in the southeast. In one corner of the new edition Erdogan is seen holding the hand of an elderly woman and the newspaper announces the president is due to host a reception for women on women's day.

With an estimated circulation of 650,000, the newspaper has been closely affiliated with Erdogan's enemy, exiled Islamic preacher Fethullah Gulen, believed to be wielding significant influence in the police and judiciary, as well as media and financial interests. Ankara accuses Gulen of running what it calls the Fethullahist Terror Organisation/Parallel State Structure (FeTO/PDY) and seeking to overthrow the legitimate Turkish authorities. In its last edition that went to print before its takeover, the newspaper warned of the "darkest days" in the history of the Turkish press, and on Saturday police fired rubber bullets and tear gas to disperse a group of the paper's supporters who were clapping in

The new administration, appointed by the court order, on Saturday abolished the contract of the newspaper's editor-in-chief Abdulhamit Bilici while newspaper employees entered the building under tight police scrutiny. Sunday's edition was the first issue after the takeover, which critics said was aimed at eradicating opposition media in Turkey, which hopes to join the European Union. "Internet has been cut off, we are unable to use our system," one of the newspaper's journalists told AFP. "The Sunday edition was not produced by Zaman's staff," the journalist said.

# **Gulen's Extradition**

The seizure of the newspaper by the state comes ahead of a critical summit today between Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu and EU leaders in Brussels. The EU has urged Turkey, its key ally in tackling the huge migrant crisis facing the continent, to uphold press freedom. The government, for its part, has denied any interference in what it termed a "legal process". "There are many media outlets in Turkey that criticise our government. None of them are subjected to legal procedures," Davutoglu told A Haber television yesterday. —AFP

# ASSAULT TO RETAKE MOSUL MONTHS AWAY

**BAGHDAD:** It will take many more months to prepare Iraq's still struggling military for a long-anticipated assault on the Islamic State group's biggest stronghold in the country, the city of Mosul, US and Iraqi officials say - and it may not even be possible to retake it this year, despite repeated vows by Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi. As the US and its allies furiously work to train thousands more troops for the daunting task of retaking Iraq's second largest city, Islamic State fighters are waging a diversion campaign of bloody suicide attacks in Baghdad and elsewhere. Their aim is to force Iraq's already overburdened security forces to spread even thinner to protect the capital and other cities rather than prepare the Mosul operation.

Iraq's answer to that has been a plan to build a wall around the capital. Meanwhile, the US-led coalition and the Iraqis are struggling to protect pockets of territory that have been recaptured from the extremists. "Mosul will be very complicated, it will be a mix of forces and it will be very important to ensure it's well planned," Brett McGurk, President Barack Obama's envoy to the US-led coalition fighting IS, said Saturday. US Army Col Christopher Garver, a coalition spokesman, put it more bluntly. "The forces that are going to conduct that assault into the city, they're not in place yet."

The northern city of Mosul, once home to more than a million people, was the biggest prize captured by IS when it swept over much of Iraq's north and west in the summer of 2014 and declared a "caliphate" across those lands and territory it holds in Syria. While Iraqi forces have clawed back some territory in the past year, retaking Mosul is considered crucial for breaking the jihadis' back in the country. Estimates of the number of IS fighters in Mosul vary from a few thousand to "not more than 10,000," according to the

The Iraqi military is still struggling to regroup. When Mosul fell to IS, more than a third of the military disintegrated as thousands of soldiers shed their uniforms and dropped their weapons to flee. In the following months, tens of thousands more Iraqi troops were identified as "ghost soldiers" - nonexistent

troops whose pay was pocketed by commanders. The US-led coalition began a training program months later in Dec 2014, but so far only 18,500 soldiers and security forces have been trained in cours-

# BRAZIL TOP JUDGES BACK GRAFT PROBE

**SAO PAULO:** Senior judges in Brazil voiced concern on Saturday over the detention of former President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, even as they threw their support behind the sweeping corruption investigation that threatens to topple his embattled successor. Lula's three hours of questioning in police custody on Friday was the highest profile development in the twoyear-old probe focused on state oil firm Petroleo Brasileiro SA (Petrobras). The detention of the 70-year-old Lula, Brazil's first working-class president and a hero to millions of his fellow citizens, shocked his supporters. His 2003-2010 government helped lift an estimated 40 million Brazilians out of poverty.

Supporters and opponents of the former union leader clashed outside his home on the outskirts of Sao Paulo after Lula was detained by police early on Friday. Supreme Court Justice Marco Aurelio Mello told CBN Radio on Saturday that "nothing justified the use of force" when police picked up Lula unannounced from his apartment. Even Justice Gilmar Mendes, who has publicly said there is strong evidence the ruling Workers' Party used graft proceeds to fund electoral campaigns, called Lula's interrogation in police custody a "delicate" situation in O Estado de S Paulo newspaper.

The federal judge who ordered Lula to be brought in for questioning, Sergio Moro, said in a statement on Saturday that steps were taken to protect Lula's image during the operation, and he expressed regret that it sparked violence. Speaking to his supporters at Workers' Party headquarters in Sao Paulo after being released on Friday, Lula said investigators were "disrespectful of democracy" and that he "deserved respect."

Lula has repeatedly denied any wrongdoing either while in office or since. President Dilma Rousseff flew from Brasilia on Saturday morning to meet with Lula in his apartment in Sao Bernardo do Campo, in a show of support for her predecessor and political mentor. She called his detention "unnecessary". But the public prosecutors in charge of conducting the probe shot back at critics' claims that Lula was handled poorly. They said police have detained 116 other suspects in the Operation Car Wash investigation in the past two years who were treated with similar care as was taken with the ex-president, and never has the public complained of the practice.

### Crackdown

Lula "is owned no more respect than any other Brazilian citizen, as he holds no power that puts him beyond the reach of the Car Wash investigation" according to the law, prosecutors said. Before Friday, some analysts had questioned whether the crackdown on graft could be at risk of fizzling out after the justice minister stepped down amid a barrage of criticism from the ruling Workers Party over the investigation. But Supreme Court justices were unambiguous in support for prosecutors pursuing their investigations into Brazil's biggest ever corruption scandal.

Justice Rosa Weber late on Friday rejected a request by Lula's lawyers to suspend investigations into real estate assets and the ex-president's institute, which police allege he and his family likely used to launder money stolen from Petrobras. Even Mello, who was critical of Lula's arrest, said the evidence uncovered by prosecutors was "very serious" and deserved further investigation. The pressure on Rousseff and Lula shows no sign of abating. Local media have reported on a spate of new plea bargains by senior politicians that could further ensnare the government. IstoE news magazine on Thursday published alleged testimony by Workers' Party Senator Delcidio Amaral claiming that Rousseff and Lula both directly benefited from corruption. He alleged Rousseff had tried to hamper the investigation. —Reuters

# BERGDAHL LAWYERS SEEK MEETING WITH TRUMP

WASHINGTON: Attorneys for Army Sgt Bowe Bergdahl said Saturday they may seek a deposition from presidential contender Donald Trump or call him as a witness at a legal proceeding, saying they fear his comments could affect their client's right to a fair trial. Bergdahl's attorney Army Lt Col Franklin Rosenblatt asked Trump in a letter dated Saturday for an interview to discuss the Republican's comments about Bergdahl, who faces military charges after walking off a post in Afghanistan in 2009. The letter sent to Trump's New York office by registered mail says the interview would determine whether they will seek to have him give a deposition or appear as a witness at a legal hearing.

"I request to interview you as soon as possible about your comments about Sergeant Bergdahl during frequent appearances in front of

large audiences in advance of his court-martial," Rosenblatt wrote in the letter on US Army letterhead. Defense attorney Eugene Fidell said Trump's statements could affect Bergahl's right to a fair trial. He added in an email to AP that the statements "raise a serious question as to whether he has compromised Sgt Bergdahl's right to a fair trial". A spokeswoman for Trump's campaign didn't immediately respond to an email and a phone call seeking comment.

Fidell had previously asked publicly that Trump cease making comments about Bergdahl such as Trump's comment in October that the soldier was a "traitor, a no-good traitor, who should have been executed." Fidell has also said previously that Trump gave incorrect information about rescue efforts for Bergdahl during public speeches.—AP



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# FAMILY, FRIENDS OF CIA AGENT DEMAND HIS RELEASE FROM IRAN

LEVINSON'S WHEREABOUTS, CAPTORS REMAIN A MYSTERY

**CORAL SPRINGS, Florida:** The family and colleagues of a former FBI agent who disappeared in Iran nine years ago while on a CIA mission expressed anger and disappointment at a rally Saturday that he wasn't part of a January prisoner exchange with Tehran. Several hundred people attended the rally for Robert Levinson, 67, who disappeared from Iran's Kish Island in March 2007. A 2013 AP investigation revealed that the married father of seven was working for the CIA on an unauthorized intelligence-gathering mission to glean information about Iran's nuclear program. If Levinson remains alive, he has been held captive longer than any American - longer than then-AP journalist Terry Anderson, who was held more than six years in Beirut in the 1980s. Unlike Anderson, Levinson's whereabouts and captors remain a mystery. US officials believe the Iranian government was behind his disappearance. It has denied that. The case drew renewed attention in January when Levinson was not part of a prisoner swap between the US and Iranian governments that freed four other Americans who had been in Iran's custody. Levinson's family insists he is still alive, even with health issues including diabetes, gout and high blood pressure. They last received video and photos of him about five years ago.

Stephanie Levinson Curry, his second-oldest child, said her autistic 9-year-old son Ryan cried for days when the other American captives were released, but not his grandfather. The rally's stage was decorated with nine chained and padlocked glass cookie jars filled with yellow rocks, each one representing a day Levinson has been held captive. The crowd held yellow signs showing the social media hashtag "whataboutbob."

"Bob Levinson has been deprived of being a grandfather, a job that he would love so much," Curry said. "We worry all the time about what he is thinking while he is alone in his cell. Even prisoners in jail get to see their families, write them letters and call them. Bob Levinson has none of that." Retired FBI agent Ellen Glasser harshly criticized the Obama administration for not demanding that Iran release Levinson or, at least, turn over information about his whereabouts. The FBI says it still investigates every lead and remains committed to finding Levinson. A \$5 million reward for information leading to his whereabouts remains in effect.

"The failure to push publicly and hard for answers about Bob was an outrage," Glasser said. "A rare opportunity was squandered when we had the most possible leverage to bring him home. Despite many requests, no new pressure was put upon Iran to produce information on Bob's status." US Rep Ted Deutch told the crowd they should send messages to Iranian President Hassan Rouhani, who is active on Twitter. "It is unfair that Bob wasn't among the Americans who came home, but because of that, our fight continues,"

Russia has a presence on Kish, a tourist island. In fact, he was meeting a source, an American fugitive, Dawud Salahuddin. He is wanted for killing a former Iranian diplomat in Maryland in 1980. In interviews, Salahuddin has admitted killing the diplomat. The CIA paid Levinson's family \$2.5 million to preempt a revealing lawsuit, and the agency rewrote its rules restricting how analysts can work with outsiders. Three analysts who had been working with Levinson lost

# THOUSANDS ATTEND FUNERAL OF HONDURAN ENVIRONMENTALIST

LA ESPERANZA, Honduras: Thousands of mourners paid their final tributes Saturday to Berta Caceres, the indigenous activist killed on Thursday, demanding justice for the renowned environmentalist. The 45year-old head of the Civic Council of Indigenous and People's Organizations (COPINH) was gunned down in her hometown of La Esperanza, 200 km northwest of the Honduran capital Tegicigalpa, in what her family has called an assassination.

Mourners from across the country attending the funeral in La Esperanza chanted "Justice, justice!" "Berta lives!" and "The struggle continues!" as her coffin was taken Caceres's brother Gustavo, one of the first to find her body, told AFP that at least two masked men entered the back of the house where his sister was sleeping early on Thursday. She got up to investigate the noise and confronted the men, who fractured her arm and leg before shooting her at least eight times at point blank range, he said. A bullet also wounded Gustavo Castro Soto of the organization Friends of the


Earth Mexico, who had been sleeping in the next room, when he came out to see what was happening. The attackers fled after he pretended to be dead. Caceres lived in the house, which belongs to her

mother, until moving out two months ago. "Now we understand it was a way to protect her family," Gustavo Caceres said. A mother of four who would have turned 45 Friday, Caceres rose to prominence for lead-

ing the indigenous Lenca people in a struggle against a hydroelectric dam project that would have flooded large areas of native lands and cut off water supplies to hundreds. In 2015, she won the Goldman Environmental Prize, considered the world's top award for grassroots environmental activism. She persevered in her activism despite numerous death threats. Caceres was arrested in 2013 for illegal possession of firearms in what critics say was harassment. She was acquitted in 2014.

Caceres's killing has drawn international condemnation, including from the United Nations, the United States and activist's family has accused the authorities of trying to mask her death as a random murder, insisting that she was assassinated because of her activism against environmental destruction by large mining and hydroelectric companies. They also accuse the government of responsibility in her murder for failing to provide protection and investigate the threats against her. —AFP

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# EU MAY PUSH TURKEY TO TAKE **BACK MIGRANTS** ON 'LARGE-SCALE'

BRUSSELS: European leaders will push Turkey at a summit vesterday to agree to "large-scale" deportations of economic migrants from Greece which is bracing for a fresh surge of migrant and refugee arrivals by the end of March.

The European Union's 28 leaders are hoping for new commitments from Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet Davutoglu at their talks in Brussels in order to curb the chaos on the west Balkans route that begins in overstretched Greece. The EU will also push Ankara to drastically reduce the huge flow of migrants into Europe, as Turkey is the launch pad for most of the more than one million refugees and migrants who have come to the continent

On Saturday, European Migration Commissioner Dimitris Avramapoulos said Greece-already struggling with a buildup of 30,000 migrants-was expected to receive "another 100,000" by the end of March. EU leaders will also try to increase aid for Greece which has seen non-EU Macedonia and EU countries on the Balkans route tighten their borders, stranding asylum seekers desperate to head northward to wealthy Germany and Scandinavia.

Macedonia allowed just 240 people to cross the border with Greece between Saturday and early yesterday morning, Greek frontier police said.

Meanwhile, there are already over 5,000 refugees and migrants waiting to cross to the Greek mainland from the Aegean islands facing Turkey, Greece's state agency ANA reported yesterday.

Donald Tusk, the European Council president and summit host, said in his invitation letter that success depended largely on securing Turkey's agreement at the summit for the "large-scale" readmission from Greece of economic migrants who do not qualify as refugees.

Syrians, who top the influx of people into Europe, are considered genuine refugees requiring admission under international law. Brussels has meanwhile unveiled a plan for saving the passport-free Schengen zone, which has been jeopardised by several countries closing their borders to stop the huge influx of people.

### 'European consensus'

"For the first time since the beginning of the migration crisis, I can see a European consensus emerging," Tusk said in his letter. Following their lunch with Davutoglu in Brussels, EU leaders are to meet by themselves. The EU said Turkey has made progress toward implementing a cooperation-for-aid deal clinched in November but added that too many people were still heading from Turkey to Greece, the main entry point to Europe.

The European Commission, the EU executive body, said in a report that the daily average of irregular arrivals in February amounted to just under 2,000, which is "high" for a winter month.

In the report to EU summit participants, the commission said encouragingly that Ankara on February 26 approved 859 readmission requests from Greece.

Prime Minister Mark Rutte of the Netherlands, which currently holds the bloc's rotating presidency, told reporters he hoped Turkey would agree today "to accelerate readmission of third country nationals and economic migrants." Rutte added: "I think that would be the minimum outcome."

The commission report urged Ankara to "swiftly negotiate and conclude readmission agreements with the relevant third countries," which would then take back economic migrants from Turkey.

In return, Rutte said, Europe could implement a more 'ambitious" plan to resettle refugees directly from camps in Turkey, which hosts 2.7 million Syrian refugees. Under the action plan, the EU will give Turkey three billion euros (\$3.3 billion) to aid refugees on its territory and Turkey will crack down on people smugglers.

# 'Decisive action'

In its report, the commission urged Turkey to "take decisive action against migrant smuggling" by stepping up police work, coast guard patrols and cooperation with NATO. Turkey on Wednesday denied claims it was blocking NATO vessels deployed in the Aegean Sea from launching a new anti-smuggling mission. Under their deal, Turkey expects to accelerate its bid for EU membership and see Brussels ease visa requirements for Turks visiting the Schengen area.—AFP

# BRITAIN FACES 'GOLDEN OPPORTUNITY' OUTSIDE **EU: LONDON MAYOR**

LONDON: London's influential mayor yesterday denied personal ambition was behind his decision to campaign for Britain to leave the European Union and said it was a "golden opportunity" for the country to forge its own trade deals with the world. Boris Johnson, whose backing for a so-called 'Brexit' has angered Prime Minister David Cameron and highlighted the deep splits within his Conservatives over Europe, said he believed the risky option was to remain inside the 28-nation bloc when Britons vote in a June 23 referendum. His comments came as German Finance Minister Wolfgang Schaeuble warned Brexit would lead to years of tortuous negotiations and create insecurity that would be "poison" to the British, European and global economies. No country has previously quit the EU, and a British departure would deprive the bloc of its number two economy and leading financial centre. Cameron says leaving would be a risky "leap in the dark".

But Johnson said it would be a "huge weight lifted from British business" and he did not believe banks' "threats" to relocate from London if it happened. "For the last few years I have said clearly if we didn't get reform we should be prepared to walk away. I think we now have a golden opportunity to shrug off a regulatory legislative burden that is profoundly undemocratic," he said in a BBC interview. "We have got a once in a lifetime opportunity, which will not come again, to strike a new series of relationships, free trade deals with the growth economies around the world, whilst maintaining ... our free trade advantages with the European Union."

Cameron has said he will not run again at the next election due in 2020, and many believe Johnson took the gamble that campaigning for 'Out' would boost his chances of succeeding him. Twice elected to run London, he is among the country's most popular politicians and seen as one of the Eurosceptic camp's chief assets. Asked if he expected to be the next prime minister, he responded: "Certainly not." As both sides accuse each other of scaremongering in an increasingly acrimonious debate, another leading 'Out' campaigner, Justice Secretary Michael Gove, told the Sunday Times that the EU's treatment of Greece in its debt crisis had fuelled the rise of far-right "Hitler worshippers" across the bloc. In the same paper, Johnson said the EU made it harder for Britain to carry out surveillance on terrorists. He criticised as "scandalous" reports that the head of the British Chambers of Commerce, which represents thousands of businesses, had been suspended for backing Brexit. —Reuters

# MACEDONIA IMPOSES FURTHER RESTRICTIONS ON REFUGEES

IDOMENI, Greece: At least 18 people drowned off the Turkish coast while trying to reach Greece yesterday, while Macedonian authorities imposed further restrictions on refugees trying to cross the Greek border.

The Turkish coast guard launched a search-and-rescue mission for other migrants believed to be missing from the accident, the state-run Anadolu Agency reported. The coast guard rescued 15 other migrants off the Aegean Sea resort of Didim, it added.

The dead included three children, according to private Dogan news agency. Meanwhile, Greek police officials said Macedonian authorities are only allowing those from cities they consider to be at war to cross the Idomeni border crossing from Greece. That means people from cities tries of the European Union is a matter of such as Aleppo in Syria, for example, can enter, but those from the Syrian capital of Damascus or the Iraqi capital of Baghdad are being stopped.

The two officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to speak on the record. The developments come a day ahead of a summit between the European Union and Turkey

to discuss the crisis.

Nearly all refugees and other migrants who enter the EU have been doing so by taking small inflatable dinghies from the Turkish coast to the nearby Greek islands. With thousands of kilometers of coastline, Greece says it cannot staunch the flow unless Turkey stops the boats from leaving its shores.

Athens has also criticized Europe for not sticking to agreements to take in refugees in a relocation scheme that never really got off the ground.

"While Idomeni is closed for refugees and the flows from the islands, from the Turkish shores to the islands, remain, it must be perfectly clear that the immediate start of a reliable process of relocation of refugees from our country to other councomplete urgency." Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras said Sunday during a speech to his

"And this is exactly what we will seek in the summit on Monday. Not just the wording that this is urgent, but that it will begin immediately and with a large number," Tsipras said.

While thousands arrive in Greece's main

port of Piraeus from the islands, about 13,000-14,000 people remain stranded in Idomeni, with more arriving each day. The refugee camp has overflowed, with thousands pitching tents among the railway tracks and in adjacent fields.

The rate at which refugees are being allowed to cross had already been reduced to a trickle, with sometimes only a few dozen, or even nobody, being allowed to cross. Greek police said 240 people crossed between 6 am Saturday and the same time yesterday morning.

The camp is beginning to take on a form of semi-permanence, with people realizing they will be spending at the very least several days in the fields. As morning broke, women swept the earth outside their tents with makeshift brooms made of twigs and leaves. Men stomped on branches pulled off trees nearby to use as firewood for small campfires to boil tea

Throughout yesterday morning, dozens of local Greeks arrived in cars packed with clothes and food donations to distribute to the refugees. Many were mobbed as they arrived at the first tents, with men, women and children scrambling to receive whatever handouts they could.

The sheer numbers have overwhelmed Greek authorities. Massive queues of hundreds of people form from early in the morning, with people waiting for hours for a lunch-time sandwich.

While Greek officials have tried to discourage more people from arriving, and no longer allow buses to drive to the Idomeni border, hundreds continue to arrive each day, walking more than 15 kilometers (10 miles) from a nearby gas station where the United Nations refugee agency has set up large tents. "We have been here five days, or six. Who remembers the days anymore," said Narjes al Shalaby, 27, from Damascus in Syria, travelling with her mother and two daughters, 5-year-old Maria and 10year-old Bara'a. Her husband and third daughter are already in Germany.

"All we do here is sleep, wake up We get hungry, we wait in the queue for two hours for a sandwich, we come back, we sleep some more," said Narjes, who worries about her daughters.

"She's grown up sooner that she should have," she says of Maria, who is sleeping in the back of the family's small tent. "She's aged." —AP

# ALBANIA OFFERS COLLECTORS ITS **COMMUNIST-ERA AIRBORNE GLORY**

RINASI AIR BASE, Albania: If you want to buy a secondhand fighter jet, Albania's the place to go right now. The 40 obsolete Soviet and Chinesemade aircraft up for sale once roared over what was Europe's most exclusive airspace. The Albanian pilots were members of an exalted military elite that had its own food-tasters and was tasked by Communist Albania's paranoid regime with deterring countless enemies who never did come to this country on the Adriatic Sea.

Now a NATO member, Albania is auctioning off the rusting jets to pay for modernizing its military and to save space in its air bases. The Socialist government says it has received strong interest from aviation collectors and museums abroad - so much that it pushed back the initial auction date and is considering raising the starting bids, first set at 1.1 million to 1.9 million leks (\$8,600-14,800).

"It was a surprise for us," Defense Minister Mimi Kodheli told The Associated Press, noting "a rush" of interest from prospective bidders in the United States, Germany, France, Italy and other countries.

In a corner of the Rinasi air base outside the capital of Tirana, 11 decrepit MiG-17 and MiG-19 jets are parked in neat rows, guarded by two military officers. Their silver-grey paint with the distinctive red, black and red roundels is fading, their tires are flat, the guns are rust-flecked and some of their glass canopies are broken. Former jet mechanic Vasil Jongari, 55, seemed almost ashamed to show the planes to visiting journalists. "There is nostalgia always," he said, running his

fingers over the 32 millimeter gun on a MiG-19. "But they cannot be kept only based on desire. They need money, and money we don't have."

Ilirjan Kola, 61, who flew Albanian air force MiG-15 to MiG-19 jets from 1976 until 1991, said the planes were always so expensive to operate.

"MiGs were so costly," he told The Associated Press. "A twin-engine MiG-19 consumed 52 liters of fuel a minute. With a normal flight of 30-40 minutes, imagine the expense ... Better that they had sold them before." Albania's air force was founded in 1951 and received MiGs from the Soviet Union until 1962. After Communist leader Enver Hoxha broke with the Russians, the country continued to be supplied with planes and spares from Communist China - until 1977, when Albania also severed ties with the Chinese.

About 160 Albanian pilots graduated from a military academy in southwestern Vlora, and used to clock up about 80 flying hours a year. Only five still serve - and now they all fly helicopters.

"We were privileged at the time, with specially chosen food, shelter, health care and vacations," Kola said. He said the food came from a dedicated farm near the air base, which a doctor tasted for them on a daily basis. —AP

# BENIN VOTES FOR PRESIDENT TO SUCCEED BONI YAYI

**COTONOU:** Benin went to the polls Sunday to choose a new president from a record field of 33 candidates but with concerns about the distribution of voters' cards that already forced a two-week delay. Polling began at 0600 GMT in the tiny West African nation, with international observers assessing the atmosphere as "very calm and very relaxed". Voting was due to end nine hours later.

Mathieu Boni, an official from a civil society group which has deployed more than 3,000 election observers, said "more than half" of the nearly 8,000 polling stations opened on time.

President Thomas Boni Yayi is bowing out after serving a maximum two five-year terms, marking him out among some African leaders who have tried to change constitutions to ensure third terms. The first results are expected within 72 hours of the vote.

# **Main contenders**

Prominent candidates include Lionel Zinsou, the Franco-Beninese financier who stepped down as head of France's biggest investment bank to become prime minister last year.

The 61-year-old is standing for the ruling Cowry Forces for an Emerging Benin (FCBE) party and is widely viewed as Boni Yayi's chosen successor. He already has the support of two opposition

parties but critics view him as an outsider "parachuted" in by former colonial power France.

Zinsou, who in the 1980s was a speechwriter for France's socialist former prime minister Laurent Fabius, cast his vote shortly before midday in the Cocotiers area of Benin's commercial hub,

Two of Benin's leading businessmen, Patrice Talon, 57, and Sebastien Aiavon, 51, are also frontrunners, pitching for the top job after previously bankrolling presidential bids.

Other favourites include economist Abdoulaye Bio Tchane and financier Pascal Irenee Koupaki, both 64, who were voting in the northern town of Djougou and Pomasse in the south.

# **Key region**

With so many candidates, political analysts predict no decisive result yesterday and believe whoever wins in the northern region will determine the overall result. Key issues in the election include job creation, tackling corruption, improving health and education, and the economy in the country, a major cotton producer.

Farmer Emile Sosa was one of the first to vote in Cocotiers, Cotonou, and said lack of opportunities for the country's young people was a major problem. —AFP

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# AGEING, INDEBTED JAPAN DEBATES RIGHT TO 'DIE WITH DIGNITY'

**TOKYO:** Retired Japanese airline employee Tarou Tanzawa said he hadn't thought much about his own death until his 84year-old mother was diagnosed with malignant lymphoma and decided against costly and invasive life-prolonging treatment. He watched his mother die peacefully at a nursing home where she received only palliative care after checking out of the hospital where she was diagnosed.

Soon after, Tanzawa made his own "living will", stipulating he did not want lifeprolonging treatment if he became terminally ill or was in a vegetative state.

"I felt it was too soon (for my mother to die) but I also thought 'Ah, there is this way of dying," Tanzawa, now 68, told Reuters. "My generation of baby-boomers ... are reaching old age, and we must confront death as a practical issue."

Although Japan has one of the world's fastest ageing populations, the country has no laws regarding "living wills", let alone assisted suicide, which is legal in a few US states such as California and some nations including Canada and Belgium. Japanese like the Tanzawas with "living wills" are a small minority. But as ageing babyboomers ponder their own demise and the country struggles with the worst public debt among advanced countries due partly to rising expenditure on medical care, the taboo on avoiding life-extending care is

The topic of "natural death" is increasingly being tackled in TV shows, newspaper and magazine articles and books; seminars on preparing for death are popular; and health experts say the use of feeding tubes for feeble elderly patients is declining.

"I think we are at a turning point in terms of attitudes," said Teruhiko Mashiko, an opposition lawmaker and head of a parliamentarians group set up a decade ago to discuss a law giving legal protection to doctors who withhold life-prolonging care with the patient's consent. "The view that it is not dignified as a human to simply be kept alive by medical treatment is becoming more common," Mashiko said in an interview.

### "CALLOUS ABANDONMENT"

The lawmakers' group drafted a new version of a bill last year but it has yet to be introduced in parliament, largely because of opposition from disability rights groups who fear it could be a first step toward legalising euthanasia. Traditional Japanese views that families are obliged to care for elderly relatives have long been an obstacle to rejecting or withdrawing life-prolonging treatment. Many families fear being accused of callous abandonment, whatever the patient's wishes.

Doctors worry about family members filing suits. Health Ministry guidelines issued in 2007 call for an informed decision by the patient or a proxy and say a decision to withdraw aggressive treatment should be made by a health care team. But these and other guidelines have not erased physicians' concerns. "We doctors want some guarantee not to be accused criminally or civilly if we stop such treatment," said Toshiharu Furukawa, head of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party's health, welfare and labour panel, and a

lawyer-doctor who has treated terminally-ill cancer patients.

The sensitivity of the topic was underscored by the outcry that greeted remarks by Finance Minister Taro Aso in 2013 when he said the ailing elderly should be allowed to "hurry up and die" and linked the issue to the high cost of medical care. Most advocates of the legal change say respect for individual rights, not cost, is the key factor and legislation would help promote the concept of "liv-

Others, though acknowledge the role of the fiscal burden. Japan's total spending on national health care topped 40 trillion yen (\$350 billion) for the first time in the year to March 31, 2014. Spending on those aged 75 and over exceeded a third of the total, a percentage set to grow as the population ages.

"We cannot say clearly that it is a problem of cost, but it is a problem," the LDP's Furukawa said. Groups representing the handicapped say such talk simply confirms what they fear - public financial woes are driving the push for legislation that could be

a first step toward legalising euthanasia of those society deems a burden.

"They say people want to die in a dignified way ... but because of the cost, they want people to have 'living wills' and reduce medical expenses," said Shoji Nakanishi, president of the non-profit Human Care Association. "If such a law is passed, it could lead to euthanasia," said Nakanishi, 72, wheel-chair bound since a spinal cord injury at age 21, when he was told he had just three months to live.

Legislation on the right to "die with dignity" is unlikely to be submitted ahead of a national election expected in July since advocates see little upside now in pushing a controversial bill. But some proponents argue that's fine, since delay will allow a changing public consensus to consolidate.

"My parents are nurses, and so is my sister, so we have a lot of debates concerning life and death at home," said Tokyo housewife Chiho Yamaguchi, 27. "We're already committed that we don't need to do those kinds of treatments. I personally think 'dying with dignity' is fine."—Reuters

Korean individuals and organizations believed to be involved in weapons development will also be added to a blacklist, it said, citing a government source.

In February, in an unprecedentedly tough move, the South announced the total shutdown of a jointly-run industrial park in

This year's will be the largestever, with the US reportedly sending more than 15,000 troops-four times as many as last year-to the Key Resolve drill, which is largely a computer-simulated exercise.

Foal Eagle-a field exercise also involving US strategic assets including a naval fleet led by an aircraft carrier and nuclear-powered submarines-is also expected to be far bigger than before.

Seoul says the drills, which continue through April 30, are defensive in nature but Pyongyang has habitually slammed them as a preparation for war.

Last month it warned it would attack the South and the US mainland in case of any armed provocation during the exercise.

Yesterday the North said the US would be to blame if war broke out. "The US is working hard to turn the Korean Peninsula into the theatre of a war, not content with slapping its unreasonable 'sanctions' against the DPRK (North Korea) over its self-defensive Hbomb test and satellite launch for peaceful purposes," according to a statement by a foreign ministry spokesman.

"No one can vouch that the door-die confrontation between the DPRK and the US will not spill over to a global thermonuclear war," said the statement quoted by the North's official news agency.

In the first move to enforce the UN sanctions, a North Korean cargo ship is being detained by the Philippines, a close US ally. Its 21 North Korean crew members remain on board the ship at Subic Bay while officials await the expected arrival of a UN team to inspect it.

The new UN sanctions requires states to inspect all cargo to and from North Korea. —AFP

# INDIA'S GUJARAT STATE ON TERROR ALERT

**AHMADABAD:** The western Indian state of Gujarat was placed on high alert yesterday after officials said they received intelligence reports that around 10 suspected militants from Pakistan had entered the state.

Policemen were checking cars and buses on highways and at the entrance of major cities and towns, said Gujarat's home minister, Rajnikant Patel. Security was also stepped up in the Indian capital, New Delhi, with more police and paramilitary troops assigned to shopping malls, railway stations and other crowded places

All vacations of policemen in the state have been canceled and they have been

asked to report back to work. Around 25 members of India's elite National Security Guards have reached Gujarat to beef up security, Patel told reporters. Some fishing boats have been found abandoned near the coast over the past few days, raising suspicions that militants from Pakistan had entered Gujarat by sea, Patel said, adding that security patrols have been increased along Guiarat's coastline in fears of an attack emanating from neighboring Pakistan.

In 2008, armed militants entered lumbai. India's financial hub, by boat from Pakistan and launched a terror attack in which 166 people were killed. —AP

# CHINA: 300,000 PUNISHED FOR CORRUPTION IN 2015

**BEIJING:** China's ruling Communist Party said yesterday that it punished nearly 300,000 officials for corruption last year. The party's official watchdog body said that 200,000 of those were given light punishments and 82,000 handed severe penalties, including demotions within the bureaucracy.

The body known as the Central Committee for Discipline Inspection rarely explains its methodology or what evidence it considers, and no other details were given in the brief statement posted on its website. President Xi Jinping has pressed a massive nationwide probe of corruption among offi-

cials of all ranks, including those in the party, government, military and staterun industries.

Hundreds of thousands of officials have been interviewed in the campaign, but only a small number have been identified. An independent database lists 1,567 as having been investigated, expelled from the party or sentenced.

Among the highest-level targets of the campaign was Zhou Yongkang, the head of a rival power network and former member of the party's inner sanctum, the Politburo Standing Committee, who was sentenced last year to life in prison for corruption. —AP

# **AFGHAN PRESIDENT:** IS BEING WIPED OUT IN AFGHANISTAN

KABUL: Afghanistan's President Ashraf Ghani said yesterday that the Islamic State group has been defeated in the eastern parts of the country, where it had taken over some remote districts. Speaking at the opening of parliament, Ghani said Afghan forces had dislodged IS loyalists from regions of Nangarhar province bordering Pakistan. "Afghanistan will be their graveyard," he said in an address broadcast live on national television.

IS has had a presence in Afghanistan for more than a year. Officials have said most militants calling themselves IS are disaffected Taleban fighters. Afghan forces have claimed victory following a 21-day operation in the Achin and Shinwar districts of Nangarhar, claiming at least 200 militants killed, a provincial official told The Associated Press.

Achin and Shinwar are among a number of districts in the remote mountainous regions along the Pakistan border that were overtaken by IS loyalists in recent months. Operations against the militants included airstrikes to destroy bases and a radio station that was broadcasting IS recruitment messages across Nangarhar province. The radio station was destroyed, along with at least seven militants, on Feb 1. "The aim of the operation in Nangarhar was to root out IS from the area," said Afghan Army Lt. Col Sharin Aqa, a spokesman for the 201 Corps. The operation was aided by local residents who set up checkpoints to help maintain security in their villages. These so-called "local uprisings" had supplemented the Afghan forces, which have been stretched since the drawdown in 2014 of the international combat mission, he

The Afghan government is attempting to end the war on its territory with hopes of drawing the Taleban into a dialogue and eventual peace talks. The IS presence has been principally in the east, where they have also fought the Taleban for territory. The Taliban have intensified their war to overthrow the Kabul government. The usual winter lull on fighting did not come in the southern regions, notably Helmand province where most of the opium that produces the world's heroin supply is grown.

Officials have said the fight in Helmand, which the Taleban consider part of their heartland, is for control of the smuggling routes, and some Taliban groups have been fighting each other. The drug production is worth up to \$3 billion a year. The Islamic State group is believed to be interested in Afghanistan because of the riches offered from contraband, including weapons, alcohol and minerals. —AP

# TWO YEARS ON, MH370 FAMILIES SAY SEARCH FOR MISSING JET MUST CONTINUE

**KUALA LUMPUR:** The families of passengers lost aboard Malaysia Airlines flight MH370 say the two-year search for the missing aircraft must go on beyond a June deadline, as new hope emerged last week of resolving the aviation mystery. Debris found off the African coast rekindled hope for many, prompting relatives like Grace Subathirai Nathan to demand investigators go back over mistakes made early on.

"A lot of it was based on calculations that had never been used before, where there's room for human error," Nathan said in an interview. Nathan's mother, Anne Daisy, was on board when MH370 disappeared on its way to Beijing from Kuala Lumpur on March 8, 2014, with 239 passen-

gers and crew on board. Some 120,000 sq km (46,300 sq mi) of the sea floor is being scoured at an estimated cost of about A\$170 million (\$124.17 million). But no trace of the missing Boeing 777 has been found except for a wing part, known as a flaperon, which surfaced on

Reunion island off Madagascar last July. Australia said in August that initial drift models of where debris from the jet might first wash up had incorrectly identified Indonesia as the most likely location. "If that could be wrong, what else could be wrong?" Nathan, a 28-year-old lawyer, said. A meeting set for June between Australia, Malaysia, and China will determine whether to extend the search.

But families are calling for the search to continue after the discovery last week of a white, metre-long chunk of metal suspected to be from MH370 off the coast of Mozambique. Just as they prepare to mark the two-year anniversary of the jet's disappearance, the relatives are asking for efforts to focus on the southeast African coast. Voice370, a support group for MH370 nextof-kin, said last week in a statement that the claims of funds drying up was "unacceptable" as a reason for ending the investigation, which they say could benefit the broader industry and increase safety.

# **BACK TO DRAWING BOARD**

On Sunday, scores of family and friends of those on board the plane gathered at a mall in Kuala Lumpur in a memorial seeking to "re-investigate, re-evaluate, re-start" the search. Accompanied by poignant musical and dance performances, the nextof-kin made an impassioned plea for search efforts to continue until the plane is found. "They can stop the search, but where do we stop the feeling of loss? We want them to try, if possible, to continue searching for MH370," said Jacquita Gonzales, the wife of MH370 in-flight supervisor Patrick Gomes. —Reuters

# FORMER US FIRST LADY NANCY REAGAN DIES

Her most publicized project as first lady was the "Just Say No" anti-drug campaign. After her husband developed Alzheimer's disease, she became an advocate for discovering a cure. She was diminutive and publicly soft spoken but Nancy Reagan's strong will, high-tone tastes and clout with her husband made her a controversial figure during his presidency.

As Reagan's wife, political partner and adviser, she became one of America's most potent first ladies, alongside the likes of Franklin Roosevelt's wife, Eleanor, Woodrow Wilson's wife, Edith, and Bill Clinton's wife, Hillary. "I see the first lady as another means to keep a president from becoming isolated," she said in 1985. "I talk to people. They tell me things. And if something is about to become a problem, I'm not above calling a staff person and asking about it. I'm a woman who loves her husband and I make no apologies for looking out for his personal and political

Tiny and frail in her later years, Reagan devoted her time to caring for her ailing husband at their home in Los Angeles' exclusive Bel Air enclave. She was always a stickler for protocol and detail and stoically presided over the former president's weeklong funeral and celebration of his

One of her most trying times as first lady came when John Hinckley stepped out of a crowd outside a Washington hotel on March 30, 1981, and fired six shots toward the president, striking him in the chest. A .22-caliber bullet punctured his lung and nearly entered his heart. "Honey, I forgot to duck," he told her at the hospital.

Some critics lambasted Nancy Reagan as a meddlesome "dragon lady", derided her anti-drug campaign and ridiculed her for consulting an astrologer to schedule presidential events. President Reagan called this view of his wife "despicable fiction", saying in 1987: "The idea that she is involved in governmental decisions and so forth and all of this, and being a kind of dragon lady - there is nothing

The reputation was established during Reagan's time as California governor and followed her to Washington. She was first accused of being a vacuous spendthrift interested chiefly in renovating and buying new china for the White House, lavish entertaining, her designer wardrobe and the like, then portrayed as a cunning manipulator of policy and people.

### Influence

Advocates of the latter view saw her influence as virtually unlimited in such matters as the dumping of presidential advisers, efforts to get a nuclear arms accord with the Soviet Union and her husband's decision to seek a second term in 1984. Some Reagan-watchers said reports of Mrs Reagan's influence were exaggerated and that it was merely the protective concern of a loving wife.

She frequently clashed with President Reagan's chief of staff, Donald Regan, who lambasted her in a 1988 "tell-all" book after he was ousted from the White House during the chaos of the Iran-Contra scandal in 1987. Regan disclosed that she had used astrology to decide the timing of presidential speeches and trips, and even her husband's 1985 cancer surgery. "Virtually every move and decision the Reagans made during my time as White House chief of staff was cleared in advance by a woman in San Francisco who drew up horoscopes to make certain that the planets were in a favorable alignment for the enterprise," Regan

James Baker, who served as White House chief of staff during Reagan's first term, took a different view, telling PBS in 2011: "If there was one person who was indispensable to Ronald Reagan's political success, it was Nancy Reagan." Nancy Reagan acknowledged she had the ear of her husband. "In most good marriages that I know of, the woman is her husband's closest friend and adviser," she wrote in her 1989 memoir, "My Turn." "... But however the first lady fits in, she has a unique and important role to play in looking after her husband. And it's only natural that she'll let him know what she thinks. I always did that for Ronnie and I always will."

Ronald Reagan was known for penning innumerable letters to his wife. In one, he stated: "I more than love you, I'm not whole without you. You are life itself to me. When you are gone I'm waiting for you to return so I can start living again." The former president's Alzheimer's struggle made Mrs Reagan a campaigner for broader human embryonic stem cell research, a stand that put her at odds with many Republicans. "Ronnie's long journey has finally taken him to a distant place where I can no longer reach him. Because of this, I'm determined to do whatever I can to save other families from this pain," she said before his death in 2004

Some critics dismissed her "Just Say No" efforts as simplistic but she became America's most visible anti-drug crusader at a time when the crack cocaine epidemic was raging. In 1988, she addressed the UN General Assembly, saying the United States must do more with tougher law enforcement and anti-drug education efforts and should stop blaming the poor nations that produce most of the narcotics used by Americans.

"We will not get anywhere if we place a heavier burden of action on foreign governments than on America's own mayors, judges and legislators. You see, the cocaine cartel does not begin in Medellin, Colombia. It begins in the streets of New York, Miami, Los Angeles and every American city where crack is bought and sold," she told the General Assembly.

### **Early life**

Mrs Reagan had her left breast surgically removed in Oct 1987 after a cancerous tumor was discovered. She was born Anne Frances Robbins into a crumbling marriage in New York on July 6, 1921. Her car-salesman father deserted the family soon after, and her mother, actress Edith Luckett Robbins, resumed her show business career two years later. In 1929, her mother married Loyal Davis, a neurosurgeon. Nancy came to adore him, even taking his name, and the doctor was believed to have had considerable influence on his eventual son-in-law's shift from Democrat to Republican years later.

After graduation from elite Smith College, she worked as a nurse's aide, then began a stage career in New York. Starting in 1949, she had an eight-year career in films including one - "Hellcats of the Navy" (1957) - co-starring with Ronald Reagan. She often took supporting roles but had starring roles like one in the 1953 B-movie "Donovan's Brain" about a scientist who kept the brain of a dead millionaire alive in a tank.

Ronald Reagan divorced another actress, Jane Wyman, in 1948. They had a daughter, Maureen, and adopted a son, Michael. At the time, Ronald Reagan headed the Screen Actors Guild. Davis was stunned when an industry newspaper published a list of communist sympathizers and her name was included (it turned out to be a reference to another actress of the same name). She sought out her future husband for assistance. During the early years of the Cold War, Hollywood blacklisted - refused to employ numerous people accused of holding communist views, ruining many careers and lives. Ronald and Nancy Reagan got married in 1952 and had two children together - Patti Davis, an actress, and Ron Jr, who pursued careers in ballet and television. — Reuters

# GULF OIL SQUEEZE SPREADS TO BANKS

Gulf banks reinforced their capital buffers in the wake of the global financial crisis so are not in any imminent danger, according to bankers and analysts. However, they don't have the same funds to deploy as before as Gulf governments have withdrawn some of their deposits to bridge budget shortfalls, which as in Europe during the euro zone crisis, has exposed the interlinked relationship between governments and banks when bond markets fall.

The trend is perhaps most prevalent in Qatar, where half its commercial lenders have announced capital plans, including the largest conventional and Islamic banks, respectively Qatar National Bank and Qatar Islamic Bank (QIB). "Market volatility has absolutely impacted plans for raising capital-boosting sukuk (Islamic bonds) but we are in a good position," Sheikh Jassim bin Hamad Al-Thani, chairman of QIB, told Reuters at the bank's annual general meeting.

QIB's total capital adequacy ratio (CAR) - a key indicator of its health - stood at 14.1 percent at the end of December, above Qatar's minimum requirement of 12.5 percent, even though its total lending jumped 46.1 percent in 2015. Although Basel III's core equity minimum is 7 percent, rising to 9.5 for the biggest global banks, most countries have set levels well above this, with Kuwait requiring 13 percent. But further increases are due which would eliminate the bank's room for manoeuvre. The 15.125 percent minimum CAR set by Oman for 2019 would put most lenders there below or close to the limit at current capital levels.

Gulf secondary bond markets have been particularly volatile since the start of the year, with the yields on perpetual bonds issued by banks to boost their capital widening significantly as prices have fallen. This has forced high-net-worth individuals and private banks, traditionally major holders of perpetual bonds, to sell and will discourage them from buying back in, Ram Mohan Nataraja, portfolio manager at Invest AD, said. "The usual latent demand will also be much lower, given the overall volatile market conditions," he added.

Although the relative illiquidity of these instruments accentuates such moves, they are generally considered riskier investments than regular bank bonds and this was apparent in some of their recent price movements. These moves suggest that enticing investors to buy new capital-boosting bonds will require banks to pay higher, more attractive coupons, something that will grate with Gulf bond issuers who are traditionally regarded as extremely price-sensitive. But limited options mean price is likely to trump pride.

Slumping stock markets - Dubai's bourse dropped 39 percent between mid-July and mid-January, while Saudi Arabia's index is down 10.1 percent year-to-date - means equity investors would be loathe to plough money into rights issues. So-called contingent-capital bonds have never been sold in the Middle East, while convertible bonds are also a rarity.

And while retaining earnings would give bank reserves a minor lift, it would cut into shareholder dividend payments which are already in the sights of local regulators. The United Arab Emirates central bank told its lenders to get approval before disclosing payouts for 2015, while Oman's regulator warned it could intervene on dividends to support capital ratios. Banks seem poised to wait for better markets to place capital-boosting bonds and sukuk, according to bankers, although time is limited. Saudi Arabia, Qatar and Oman are among the countries expected to issue bonds and the start of the holy month of Ramadan in June may mark the start of a three-month market shutdown for the Middle East's long summer break. — Reuters

raised their interest rates in December, tracking the US Federal Reserve, even though their economies needed exactly the opposite. The Gulf states now face a dilemma of whether to keep the pegs or opt for a flexible exchange rate regime, allowing their currencies to fall against the greenback. "Maintaining a peg is a costly affair. The central bank has to be willing to buy or sell its currency in the open market to maintain the peg, which could deplete forex reserves," said M.R. Raghu, head of research at Kuwait Financial Centre.

"Oil exports, which account for about 80 percent of (GCC) government revenues, have fallen by 70 percent since mid-2014, thus making the currency peg vulnerable as it reduces the foreign exchange reserves," Raghu told AFP. For now GCC states, with the exceptions of Bahrain and Oman, have huge reserves to defend their pegs. But some speculators are betting that the Gulf states, particularly Saudi Arabia, will be unable to maintain the currency links indefinitely.

Jan Randolph, director of Sovereign Risk Analysis at IHS Global Insight, believes the contrasting performances of the US and Gulf economies will increase pressure on the pegs. Monetary policies are also expected to diverge - "stimulating in the GCC and gradual tightening in the United States," Randolph told AFP. GCC states need weak currencies and low interest rates to boost their waning economies, especially to develop non-oil export sectors, Randolph said. The longer the economic divergence continues, "the more sense it makes to move to a more flexible exchange rate regime," he said.

Maintaining the dollar pegs brings financial stability and certainty to GCC economies amid regional geopolitical ten-

sions. It also helps contain inflation and boost confidence for foreign investment. Oil producers like Russia, Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan, and Nigeria have already devalued their currencies, raising oil revenues in local currency terms which helped to curb their current account and budget deficits.

But there is a cost. Devaluation "typically causes higher inflation and often results in falling living standards, which can undermine social stability," Standard and Poor's said in a recent report. Analysts say that if GCC states de-peg from the dollar, some currencies risk falling by 20 percent or more. That would boost oil revenues and the value of GCC fiscal reserves in their sovereign wealth funds in terms of local currencies, said Sebastian Henin, head of asset management at Abu Dhabi-based The National Investor.

The hospitality sector of the Gulf emirate of Dubai would also benefit as it becomes a more affordable tourist destination and more attractive to non-oil businesses, Henin told AFP. That is why some analysts and speculators anticipate that the United Arab Emirates could be the first to end its dollar link. Another risk of abandoning the dollar peg is a capital flight from the Gulf, Raghu said. "Capital outflows would be exacerbated as investors would like to move their assets to other markets. This would increase volatility and financial uncertainty in the region," he said.

Raghu thinks an end to the peg would happen "only as an extreme measure". Mohamed Zidan, chief market strategist at ThinkForex, a Dubai-based brokerage firm, said the peg regime "is costly and hurting the economy". "GCC states are defending it now for stability, but if the low oil price continues, they will opt for a managed floating regime within five

Zalzalah said MPs said they will abide by what the Amir said because this is the way out for the economic problems facing the country. The government and Assembly have failed to strike a deal on a way to reduce subsidies on petrol, electricity and water as part of the government's economic reform plans. So far, the two sides have held a series of meetings and MPs have resisted plans to hike electricity charges, saying it will harm low- and middle-income citizens. More meetings are planned and the government hopes to convince the Assembly before the new fiscal year takes effect on April 1. Local newspaper Al-Anbaa quoted finance ministry undersecretary yesterday as saying the government plans to start hiking electricity charges in 2017.

The Assembly's health committee meanwhile told Health Minister Ali Al-Obaidi that they want the new Jaber Hospital in South Surra to be reserved exclusively for Kuwaiti patients. Rapporteur of the committee MP Saadoun Hammad said the committee also asked the minister that the hospital should include all specializations in a bid to reduce the number of Kuwaiti patients sent abroad, which has become a controversial issue after the government decided to cut spend-

During the meeting, MPs also asked the minister to amend some provisions in new rules issued by the ministry recently to cut expenditures for sending patients abroad. During a debate on the issue last week, the Assembly was told that allocations for this item were a mammoth KD 441 million in the current fiscal year.

# FLEXISECURITY: DREAM FOR FIRMS, NIGHTMARE FOR SHORT-TERM WORKERS

n 2009 the Nissan factory in Barcelona in northeastern Spain seemed condemned to close. But it was saved thanks to labor rights sacrifices, becoming a symbol of "flexisecurity" - a cooperative approach to labor relations in which employees accept a degree of flexibility in working arrangements - which is being held up as an example to follow in France even as it remains the focus of debate in Spain. Production at the plant plunged from 197,000 vehicles in 2007 to 44,000 vehicles in 2009.

Then no new orders arrived. "We had to react, become competitive and flexible," the vice president of Nissan in Spain, Frank Torres, told AFP. Employers and employees reached an agreement to allow for a longer work day and lower salaries for new hires and in exchange the plant received orders to produce five new models of vehicles.

"If we had not accepted, we would have had 2,000 colleagues turned out in the street," said Enrique Saludas, the head of the main union at the factory, which employs 3,500 workers. Similar measures were adopted in the entire auto sector, which accounts for ten percent of Spain's economic output. The country's total motor vehicle production rose by 11.1 percent last year.

# Weakens Workers' Rights

The cornerstone of this policy was a labor market reform adopted in 2012 by acting Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy's conservative Popular Party government. At the time the unemployment rate stood at 22.5 percent after 2.6 million jobs were lost during the past four years of economic crisis. The reform created a new openended contract which can be used by small and medium sized businesses for employees who are under the age of 30 which allows dismissals without justification during the first year of employment.

It also drastically reduced the amount of compensation that must be paid when workers are let go and allows for collective dismissals, even when a firm is not facing economic difficulties. The reform also weakens workers' rights, such as a prohibition on unilaterally changing work conditions. Four years later the reform - which triggered a general strike - remains controversial. Socialist leader Pedro Sanchez vowed to revoke the reform when he took the helm of the party in June 2014.

But the party has softened its stance since it allied itself with new market-friendly party Ciudadanos last month following an inconclusive December general election. "Your pact does not defend workers. You have left the door open to lowering the cost of dismissals," the head of new far-left party Podemos, Pablo Iglesias, said Wednesday in parliament as he announced his party would vote against Sanchez's big to form a government.

# 'Work Becoming More Precarious'

"The goal of this reform was to create jobs but what it has achieved in fact was make it possible to fire workers at will," said labour lawyer Ramon Hernandez Carrera. Labor law flexibility has been pursued in other nations in Europe as well. In Germany a plan introduced in 2005 by a Social Democratic government encouraged so-called "mini-jobs" - short-term contracts which are exempt from tax and social charges if they pay workers less than Ä450 a month. "Every day the global economic market requires greater flexibility, we can't oppose this reality," said Jordi Garcia Vina of Spanish business association CEOE.

After Spain returned to growth in 2014, the country began to create jobs - over a million in two years, the vast majority short term contracts. The unemployment rate registered a record fall last year, dropping nearly three percentage points to 20.9 percent, although it still remains the highest rate in the eurozone's after Greece's. "Unemployment is falling but the price is that work is becoming more precarious. Lower salaries are offered and much more is demanded from the worker," said Beatriz Toribio, spokesman for Infojobs, Spain's main employment website.

Between 2011 and 2014 the average salary in Spain rose by 2.1 percent to 1,881 euros (\$2,042) while inflation rose 5.2 percent. The percentage of contracts that pay less than the monthly minimum wage of 752 euros rose during this period to 13 percent from eight percent. The labour market reform is "unfair and a failure", said Antonio Ferrer of Spain's UGT union, who points out the jobless rate remains high. A study by Spanish bank BBVA defends the reform, arguing if it had been adopted earlier, in 2008, it would have prevented the destruction of one million jobs. —AFP

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# AFGHANS FEEL FORGOTTEN IN MIGRANT CRISIS

s the European Union and Turkey focus on stemming the flow of Syrian refugees attempting perilous journeys across the Aegean sea to Greece, another migrant community whose numbers are also swelling says it is being overlooked. Largely denied the chance for legal resettlement in Europe and struggling to find work or support in Turkey, Afghans account for around a quarter of the migrants risking their lives in the small boats leaving Turkey's shore.

Ahead of an emergency European Union summit with Turkey on Monday, the EU executive has announced the first payouts from a 3 billion euro (\$3.3 billion) fund meant to help Turkey cope with an influx of more than 2.7 million Syrian refugees and encourage them to stay put. But while Afghans are unlikely to be prevented from using services such as medical centres and education facilities set up with European funds in Turkey, the fact they speak Pashto and Dari, rather than Arabic, risks excluding them from projects designed for Syrian refugees, aid workers warn.

"The EU is not even discussing these issues and is exclusively focused on Syria," Kati Piri, the European Parliament's rapporteur for Turkey, told Reuters last month. "Even if the Syrian crisis would be solved tomorrow, there would still be a serious refugee crisis, with a large number of refugees in Turkey who don't have access to their rights." Afghan migrants in Turkey interviewed by Reuters said that over the past few years they had been denied interviews with UN refugee agency UNHCR that would formally determine their refugee status, a key step in the journey to being resettled.

Polat Kizildag, program coordinator at ASAM, an organization which registers asylum seekers in Turkey, said they were generally told they were ineligible because Turkey was the third country on their journey and the expectation was that they apply for refugee status in their second, in many cases Iran. Human rights groups have said Iranian forces deport thousands of Afghans without giving them a chance

to prove their asylum status and that they are pressured to leave the country.

"We want to stay (in Turkey) but ... there is no support here. It's too expensive," said Najebullah, 45, a father of four originally from Kabul waiting in Cesme, on Turkey's Aegean coast, to make an illegal crossing to the Greek Island of Chios. "In Europe we will get work and they will help us," he said, echoing a commonly-held belief among the migrants flooding to Turkey's shore that once they arrive in Europe they will be more easily able to build a new life.

Selin Unal, UNHCR spokeswoman in Turkey, said the most vulnerable, including Afghans, still received interviews, adding that close to 500 Afghans had been interviewed last year. She said the sheer numbers meant those most at risk were prioritized among UNHCR's active case load of some 254,000 non-Syrians.

# Resettlement Woes

More than 63,000 Afghans came to Turkey last year, a sharp rise from 15,652 in 2014, according to ASAM, counting only those who registered. Some came directly from Afghanistan, others from Iran, where they had tried unsuccessfully to settle. Kirikkale, near Turkey's capital Ankara, is one of several satellite towns where registered Afghans are allowed to reside. Hakima Rezai, in her late thirties, said she was trying to get to Europe to be reunited with her four children, taken to Europe by sea by her brother-in-law almost a year ago. She said UNHCR - which declined to comment on individual cases - had told her they could not help.

Rezai lives in a single room with a coal-burning stove and relies on the charity of neighbours. She does not receive the cash cards given to some Syrian refugees by international NGOs and their local partners to help meet basic living costs because there is no such scheme specifically set up for Afghans. "I cry every day," she said, showing the identity documents of her absent children. The exodus from Afghanistan has been prompted by an increasingly precarious security situation, with 11,000 civilians killed or

injured in 2015, as well as widespread corruption undermining faith in the future and a war-ruined economy that cannot provide enough work for its population.

Kabul and other Afghan cities have seen a spate of suicide bombings and other attacks as the Taleban has stepped up its insurgency following the withdrawal of international troops from most combat operations in 2014. The insurgents, driven from power by a US-led campaign in 2001, are seeking to re-impose hardline Islamist rule and are now in control or threatening around a third of the country.

# False Perceptions

According to the European Commission, 64,109 asylum requests were registered in Turkey in 2015, more than 11,000 of them from Afghan citizens, but only 459 were concluded, either by granting or rejecting refugee status. Some are still waiting in Turkey, but others are among the thousands to have crossed illegally to Europe. Under a law passed two years ago, Afghans and other refugees have access to healthcare in Turkey and Unal said the most vulnerable could also benefit from social security schemes.

In January, Turkey also passed a new law to give refugees access to legal employment, a move praised by the European Union, although the program has not yet been rolled out. But many of the Afghan refugees, hampered in part by language difficulties, are unaware of their rights and rely on illegal labor such as fruit picking to survive.

Birnur Esen, a psychologist who works for IMECE, an organization which collects and distributes clothes and other supplies to migrants rescued at sea, said convincing migrants to stay in Turkey meant improving their lives there and making them realize conditions in Europe would be just as difficult. That, she said, should be the focus of European efforts. "We are trying to change their mind," she said. "Europe must stand behind Turkey. It must say that if you stay in Turkey, we will improve your conditions." —Reuters

# SCANDAL TAINTS WORKING-CLASS HERO LULA

former metalworker who rose to become one of the most popular presidents in Brazilian history, Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva now sees his legacy under threat after being implicated in a huge corruption probe. Lula, as he is known to all in Brazil, left office in 2011 as a blue-collar hero who presided over a watershed boom and helped lift tens of millions of people from poverty. He was so widely admired as president that Foreign Policy magazine called him a "rock star" and US counterpart Barack Obama called him "the man".

Known for his charisma and common touch, Lula's popularity in Brazil and the success of the economy during a period of high commodities prices helped him ride out numerous corruption scandals. When he stepped down after two terms, he basked in 80 percent popularity ratings. But five years after helping handpicked successor Dilma Rousseff take his place in the presidency, graft allegations have left him fighting for his reputation - and potentially his freedom.

The gruff, bearded leftist was briefly detained for questioning Friday in the investigation into a massive embezzlement and bribery conspiracy centered on state oil company Petrobras. Prosecutors accused Lula, 70, of accepting "many" favors from corrupt construction companies seeking Petrobras contracts. They also suggested that they are looking at an allegedly more central role played by Lula in the scheme that has already seen charges against scores of people, many of them politicians and businessmen closely tied to Lula's Workers' Party. Lula, who was not charged, has rejected any involvement in the Petrobras scheme.

Poverty to Power

Lula grew up in deep poverty, the last of eight children born to a family of farmers in the arid, hardscrabble northeastern state of Pernambuco. He had little formal education, quitting grade school to help his family get by. When he was seven, his family joined a wave of migration to the industrial heartland of Sao Paulo state, where Lula worked as a shoeshine boy and street vendor before becoming a steel worker. As a teenager, he lost the little finger on his left hand in a machine accident. But in an early sign of his toughness, he not only persevered but became president of his trade union, less than a decade after joining.

He was the force behind big strikes in the 1970s that challenged the military dictatorship in power at the time. And in 1980, Lula founded the Workers' Party, first standing as its candidate for president nine years later. Lula made three unsuccessful presidential bids from 1989 to 1998, each time chipping away at the establishment parties and the idea that a poor, uneducated labor leader could never be president of Brazil. The fourth time, in 2002, he succeeded, taking office on Jan 1, 2003. "The majority of the population has given me the opportunity to prove that a mechanic shift worker can do for this country what the elite never managed to do," he said at the time.

# Glory Days

Lula soon calmed market fears of a radical surge to the left by adopting fiscally responsible policies, dark suits and a calm, pragmatic approach. He also had the good fortune to preside over a so-called golden decade for Latin America, when a rising

China's ravenous demand for raw materials propelled the region's economies to a historic period of growth. Brazil's economy hit a breakneck 7.5 percent growth in 2010, his final year in office.

Despite a series of scandals in his first term - most notably a congressional vote-buying case that felled his chief of staff - Lula coasted to reelection in 2006. He became a star of the emerging markets boom of the 2000s, reinforcing alliances across the world's developing nations. Constitutionally limited to two consecutive terms, he cemented his legacy by helping Rousseff into power.

# Question Over Comeback

But his post-presidential life has been fraught with difficulties. In Oct 2011 he was diagnosed with cancer in the larynx and successfully underwent chemotherapy. Although he has flirted repeatedly with the possibility of running to succeed Rousseff in 2018, he is an increasingly divisive figure, loved by his leftist, working-class base but loathed by the more well-off. With Brazil's economy in deep recession, Rousseff highly unpopular, and the Petrobras corruption scandal heating up, Lula's political mastery has never been under greater challenge.

under greater challenge.

He was defiant after his release from police questioning. "I escaped dying from hunger before I was five. That was one miracle. The second was getting a diploma as a metal worker. Another was getting a political conscience. "Another was founding a party. Another miracle was getting to the presidency of the republic and I was better than all of them - the political scientists, doctors and lawyers who presided over the country," he said. "It's not all over as I thought," he added. "It's time to start again." —AFP

# MCGREGOR STUNNED BY DIAZ AT UFC 196

LAS VEGAS: UFC featherweight heavy blow. McGregor had landed champion Conor McGregor was choked into submission by Nate Diaz in a stunning reverse at the MGM Grand in Las Vegas. McGregor, who was denied a chance to become the first fighter to hold two UFC belts at the same time when lightweight champ Rafael dos Anjos pulled out with a foot injury, struggled in the

second round after Diaz landed a

some heavy left-hand shots of his own in the first round, opening up a cut over Diaz's right eye that streamed blood as he struggled to cope with McGregor's quick feet and hands.

The 27-year old Irish fighter, who took just 13 seconds to knock out Jose Aldo and win the featherweight crown, couldn't put the 30-year-old away, and when Diaz landed a punch in the second round McGregor looked stunned. Sensing that McGregor was hurt, the Californian suddenly seemed more energetic and went after him, firing off a series of hooks and jabs that found their

Struggling to stay in the fight, McGregor took it to the mat, but it was a move that backfired in stunning fashion as he suffered more punishment from the heavy-hitting Diaz. A black belt in jiu-jitsu, Diaz then slipped behind him and applied the choke hold that finished the fight, silencing the thousands of Irish fans for the first time on the night. A win against Diaz would have left McGregor in the enviable position of being able to take on Robbie Lawler for the welterweight belt, or fighting Rafael dos Anjos for the lightweight

UFC boss Dana White had said in the lead-up to the fight that it was hard to deny McGregor at the moment, and a fight against Lawler would definitely draw an enormous pay-per-view audience.

But Diaz, who took on this fight at short notice, will surely believe that the defeat of McGregor means that he deserves a shot at the title.

The fight was preceded by Tate's sensational victory over reigning bantamweight champion Holm, who waited patiently throughout the fight for her chance to take her opponent down before choking her out late in the fifth round. "She went out like a champion. I have so much respect for this woman," the 29-year-old Tate told the octagon announcer as she received the belt. —Reuters

# CAVENDISH STRUGGLES AS GAVIRIA WINS WORLD OMNIUM

**LONDON:** Mark Cavendish's hopes of competing at the Rio Olympics were dealt a blow as he finished sixth in the omnium at the Track Cycling World Championships in London on Saturday.

Cavendish had been set a target of a top three finish by British Cycling coaches if he is to win selection to their Rio squad, but poor showings in the time trial and individual pursuit saw him finish outside the medal places as Fernando Gaviria Rendon took gold.

"I wanted to test it. I don't know if I am going," Cavendish said of his Olympic hopes.

"But I really wanted to test myself

against the best riders. "Hopefully I did enough for selection. I don't know. We are incredibly lucky with GB that we have a group of strong guys to go to the Olympic Games. We have got an absolute load of riches."

Colombian Gaviria successfully defended his title in the tightest possible finish in front of 8,000 fans at the Lee Valley VeloPark.

The Etixx-Quick-Step road rider edged out two rivals in an amazing finish to the six-discipline event with a masterful tactical display in the points

With the lead changing hands multiple times over the 160 laps of the deciding points race, the top three positions were not decided until the 16th and final sprint of the 40-kilometre race as the 21-year-old Gaviria came over the line ahead of Roger Kluge of Germany and Australian Glenn O'Shea.

That trio were tied on 191 points with the countback being determined by their respective finishing positions on that final sprint.

"It was an epic battle," said Gaviria. "All the riders were very strong and I'm just pleased I managed to defend

"People say I'm crazy, I don't think about the race too much, I just go with the flow and try not to make many childish mistakes that would be normal for someone of my age."

"I feel like I've been making too many mistakes, so to eliminate the mistakes out there today and hole a lot of good putts and give myself a lot of (birdie) looks, I felt really good about it," added Mcllroy, who is seeking his 12th PGA Tour win. "I just need to do more of the same tomorrow."

Australian Scott, winner of the Honda Classic last week, bogeyed two of the last six holes on the way to a 73 and a share of second at nine-under with long-hitting American Dustin Johnson (71).

Two ahead of the chasing pack overnight, Scott bogeyed the par-three fourth after missing the green off the tee to fall back into a tie for the lead with McIlroy, who picked up a shot at the opening hole. McIlroy sank a seven-foot birdie putt at the

# **SINGLE LADY**





# ISNER PUTS US THROUGH TO DAVIS CUP Q-FINALS

**MELBOURNE:** John Isner fended off Australia's Bernard Tomic 6-4 6-4 5-7 7-6(4) yesterday to book the United States a berth in the Davis Cup quarter-finals for the first time in three years.

The world number 11's win on a steamy afternoon at Melbourne's Kooyong Lawn Tennis Club sealed the tie 3-1 with a singles rubber in hand, while silencing a raucous crowd of yellow-clad fans. "Our team prepared very, very well and I think it showed out here," Isner, who closed out the contest with his 49th ace on match point,

said courtside. The win will take some heat off US captain Jim Courier, who came into the tie on the back of two first-round exits from the team tournament. "We knew it was going to be very difficult," said Courier, whose team will face Croatia or Belgium in the last eight in July. "Our team certainly came good, John stepped up so big ... and finally cracked it there in the breaker which was really impressive." The United States, Davis Cup champions 32 times, arrived Down Under early to prepare and had first practice on Kooyong's temporary grass court even before Australia's team had assembled in Melbourne. The Lleyton Hewittcaptained Australia lost young gun Nick Kyrgios to a virus in a major blow in the leadup but Isner led off superbly for the Americans with a dominant win over Sam Groth in the opening singles.

He also appeared set to cruise to another emphatic win on Sunday before wobbling when serving late in the fourth set. Tomic finally broke the towering American on the fifth set point but neither player offered a look at the other's serve in the decider. Isner's chief weapon would ultimately prevail, as he blasted a string of huge serves to seal the tiebreak and condemn Australia to a first round exit after their run to the semifinals last year. — Reuters

# INDIA CLINCH ASIA CUP

**DHAKA:** Opener Shikhar Dhawan hit a careerbest 60 as India won the Asia Cup for the sixth time after beating host Bangladesh by eight wickets yesterday. Bangladesh was put into bat and posted 120-5 in a rain-hit game that was reduced from 20 to 15 overs after a two-hour delay. India won with seven balls to spare, reaching 122-2 as skipper Mahendra Singh Dhoni smashed a towering mid-wicket six. Dhawan and Virat Kohli combined for a 94-run partnership for the second wicket after India was reduced to 5-1.

Kohli was unbeaten on 41, while Dhoni was on 20. Bangladeshis fast howlers Taskin Ahmed (1-14) and Al-Amin Hossain (1-30) shared the wickets. To the delight of the home crowd, Al-Amin broke through in just the second over when he swung one nicely to get the edge of Rohit Sharma (1) who was caught by Soumya Sarkar at first slip. Dhawan and Kohli spent some uncomfortable moments at the crease against the pace of Al Amin and Taskin. They took their frustration out on Abu Haider, who was playing his first match. Haider conceded 14 runs in his first over and the quick didnít bowl further in the match. Both Dhawan and Kohli also found Shakib Al Hasanís left-arm spin to their liking as they kept India in the hunt.

Taskin returned to his second spell to remove Dhawan with a low full toss after the batsman had hit nine fours and one six in his 44-ball 60.

# AUSTRALIA WINS ON LAST BALL TO BEAT S AFRICA IN SECOND T20

**JOHANNESBURG:** Australia chased down top-scored with 79 off 41 balls, opener 204 in a thrilling last-ball victory over South Africa in the second Twenty20 international yesterday to level the three-game series at 1-1. Australia's chase was powered by a brilliant partnership of 161 between David Warner, who made 77 off 40 balls, and Glenn Maxwell, who got 75 off 43. The pair took Australia from 32-3 to 193-4.Maxwell fell in the penultimate over and Warner was out first ball of the last over, leaving new batsmen Mitchell Marsh and James Faulkner to get 11 off the final

five balls to win. Helped by two wides in that last over from Kagiso Rabada, the Australians scrambled home to 205-5, running two off the last delivery to clinch a victory that appeared way out of their reach at 32-3 in the sixth over. Dale Steyn, on his return from a two-month injury layoff, took 2-32 to slow Australia in that early spell. Rabada also claimed two wickets (2-25), but his joy at bowling Warner with a yorker to start the last over quickly disappeared as he struggled right at the end. Marsh and Faulkner scrambled two -runs and singles helped by the two extra balls - before Marsh lobbed the last ball down the ground and Faulkner sped back to the danger end to complete a second run, and send the series to a deciding game in Cape

The rousing victory ended a run of five straight T20 defeats for Australia, just in time for the upcoming World Cup in India. Put in to bat by Australia at the Wanderers, a ground which is high-scoring and often good to chase on, South Africa posted a big score of 204-7. Captain Faf du Plessis

Quinton de Kock got 44 at the top of the innings, and David Miller hit a quick 33 off 18 in the middle order. Faulkner, on his recall to the team, was Australia's best bowler with 3-28. He also won the game with the bat. Warner and Maxwell came together with Australia well behind following the loss of Aaron Finch for two in the first over, Shane Watson for nine and captain Steven Smith for 19.

Even at the halfway stage of the innings, the Aussies still needed 12 an over for the last 10 overs. But Warner and Maxwell accelerated dramatically, with

# MARSEILLE HELD BY TOULOUSE, RENNES THRASH NANTES 4-1

PARIS: Marseille's hopes of qualifying for Europe look all but over after they were held to an entertaining 1-1 draw by struggling Toulouse at the Velodrome yesterday, while Rennes thrashed Nantes 4-1.

Marseille missed a host of good chances, and Wissam Ben Yedder ran clear to slot Toulouse ahead in the 55th minute. Relegation-threatened Toulouse were supposed to be playing their first game under new coach Pascal Dupraz, but he was absent after suffering a heart scare at training on Saturday and spending the night in hospital under observation. And the away defence imploded, as they have done all season, as Somalia put through his own net with 16 minutes to play.

Coach Michel has come under increased pressure in recent weeks, but Marseille would have expected to end a club record 11-match streak without a home win in the league against relegation-threatened Toulouse. But instead they were held and stay seven points off the top three, and with Lyon playing later yesterday that gap could quickly become eight. Toulouse remain second-from-bottom in the table and nine points from safety. "This was a very hard game for us, it was unbelievable that it was still 0-0 at half-time," bemoaned Spanish coach Michel. "It's been happening all year, nothing this season will go our way. Once again our best opponent was the goalkeeper.

"I think the strikers are missing so many opportunities because they have lost confidence. In our last two games we have created 11 and 15 chances, but have scored only two goals. "We needed to win, one point was useless." The hosts desperately needed all three points to keep alive their hopes of qualifying for next season's Champions League, and they started brightly with plenty of early crosses being sent in the direction of Steven Fletcher. The Scot set up a decent chance for Remy Cabella, but his powerful strike was beaten clear by Toulouse goalkeeper Alban Lafont. The 17-year-old had to be alert again soon after, getting down quickly to keep out a low effort from Michy Batshuayi.

The best chance of the first half fell to Mauricio Isla, but the Chilean was denied by the right boot of Lafont at point-blank range.

### **SUCKER PUNCH**

But Michel's side were punished for their profligacy in front of goal when Ben Yedder raced through to give Toulouse an unlikely lead. The home defence were caught sleeping and the 25year-old forward took advantage with a cool finish for his tenth league goal of the season. Toulouse were hanging on desperately as they looked to end a 10-match run without a win, and for just a fourth league clean sheet of the season. But they shot themselves in the foot as Lafont spilled the ball straight to Fletcher, whose deflected effort was miskicked into his own net by Somalia. Yann Bodiger almost restored Toulouse's advantage, but Steve Mandanda produced an excellent flying save from the substitute's rising drive. Suddenly Marseille were struggling, but they were indebted to their keeper again as Mandanda brilliantly kept out Oscar Trejo with a one-handed stop. Martin Braithwaite also had a glorious opportunity to win the game for Toulouse, but the Dane blazed over when he should have scored. Meanwhile, Rennes ended Nantes' 13-match unbeaten run in the league in emphatic style, as young striker Ousmane Dembele scored a hat-trick at Roazhon Park.

The 18-year-old opened the scoring within the first minute as he reacted guickest after a set-piece was not fully cleared. Supersub Kamil Grosicki was given a rare start by Rolland Courbis and the Pole doubled the lead inside the first quarter of an hour, before Dembele's free-kick evaded everyone in the middle to put the result beyond doubt. Dembele completed his treble before half-time, and although Adryan's strike and a second yellow card for Giovanni Sio gave Nantes a glimmer of hope, Rennes held on with ease.

# HIDDINK CONFIDENT OVER COSTA FITNESS FOR PSG CRUCIAL CLASH

LONDON: Guus Hiddink dismissed concerns over Diego Costa's fitness by insisting the Spain striker will be available for Chelsea's crucial Champions League clash with Paris Saint Germain on Wednesday.

Costa missed Saturday's 1-1 Premier League draw against Stoke as he rested to avoid aggravating a tendon injury, but Blues interim manager Hiddink is confident his star forward will return for the last 16, second leg against PSG.

With the French champions holding a 2-1 lead, Hiddink can't afford to be without the in-form Costa, especially as Chelsea laboured without him in a match that prompted the Dutchman to dismiss their top four hopes as "impossible" and set his sights on success in Europe and the FA Cup.

"Diego had a problem on the tendon, that's why I was cautious not to worsen the situation, but I think he will be OK

on Wednesday," Hiddink said. "I think the top four is difficult, almost impossible especially when other teams are knocking on that door.

"I am very respectful of the likes of West Ham who got a good result today (at Everton). On the other hand we know where we came from in December, one point off the relegation zone, and amazingly we got safe in a relatively short time.

"We got into mid-table which normally for Chelsea standards is not enough. But if we can go into a very beautiful March and April that would be nice in the Champions League and FA Cup." Bertrand Traore, the exciting 20year-old from Burkina Faso, started in attack in the absence of Costa, and justified his manager's faith with his second Premier League goal, a spectacular leftfooted shot from 20 yards six minutes before the break.

Messi doubled his tally from the penalty spot before Suarez lashed home the fourth six minutes from time. Barca's 11th consecutive league win also stretches their record unbeaten run to 36 games. Atletico Madrid can close the gap at the top to eight points when they visit Gary

Neville's Valencia later yesterday. Real Madrid remain 12 points adrift of Barca in third despite Cristiano Ronaldo's four-goal show in a 7-1 demolition of Celta Vigo on Saturday. "It is evident we are well-positioned in the league, but there are plenty of points to play for and meetings with direct rivals to come," said Barca

boss Luis Enrique.

"I am very happy to see the team evolve and improve without ever losing their ambition."

The European champions were without the suspended Neymar, who made the most of his free weekend to return to his native Brazil.

However, El Haddadi made the most of his rare chance to start with a simple finish at the back post eight minutes in after Messi's brilliant pass had played in Suarez behind the Eibar defence. Suarez was surpassed by Ronaldo in the fight to be La Liga's top scorer and the Uruguayan look determined to hit back early on, but fluffed his lines with just Abel Riesgo to beat two minutes later. El Haddadi should have teed up Suarez for a tap-in from another Messi through ball midway through the half, but the youngster overhit his pass and the ball slipped just wide. Eibar then enjoyed a concerted period of pressure and were desperately unlucky not to level when Borja Baston's cross hit Sergio

Busquets and flew inches past the far post.

Yet, just when Eibar looked the most likely to score, Messi killed the game as a contest as he intercepted the ball in midfield and drove towards the Eibar goal before firing into the far corner for his 20th league goal of the season.

The second half was far shorter on goalmouth action, but there was time for Messi to put Barca's recent troubles from the penalty spot behind him when Ivan Ramis blocked the Argentine's cross with his hand.

Messi took responsibility after Suarez had missed from the spot against Rayo Vallecano in midweek and coolly dispatched the penalty for his 35th goal of the season.

And Suarez finally got the goal he craved to move back to within one of Ronaldo in the scoring charts with a brilliant nutmeg of Capa before smashing the ball into the far corner. That goal also took Suarez, Messi and Neymar's combined tally for the season to 100. — AFP

# JUVENTUS RESTORES 3-POINT LEAD WITH WIN AT ATALANTA

MILAN: Juventus restored its three-point advantage at the top of Serie A with a 2-0 win at Atalanta

Andrea Barzagli and Mario Lemina scored for Juventus while Gianluigi Buffon had a ninth successive clean sheet. The goalkeeper has not been beaten in Serie A in 836 minutes, the third-longest stretch in league history.

Napoli beat Chievo Verona 3-1 on Saturday. "The lads are doing well, we have won 17 of the last 18 matches but the second and third teams are still close," Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri said. "The title will be decided on the last day. "We did well in the first 50 minutes, then there was a drop and in that regard we have to improve in managing the lead." Below them the battle for third place and final Champions League spot is heating up. Fifthplace Inter Milan hosts Palermo later and is currently eight points behind Roma, which beat Fiorentina on Friday to move three points clear of its opponent. AC Milan could have leapfrogged Inter, temporarily at least, but lost 2-0 at 10-man Sassuolo. Coach Sinisa Mihajlovic was sent off for dissent after the second goal.

"I am very angry with us and the referees but I don't speak about referees," Mihajlovic said. "We dominated in the first half-hour but as often happens, we struggle to score goals. We can't create chances and then concede on our opponents' first chance. "I protested because he didn't blow for a foul," he said. "I was angry also with my players who stopped, which they shouldn't have done."

At the other end of the table, Frosinone beat fellow struggler Udinese 2-0 to give it hope of avoiding relegation. It is one point below Palermo, which occupies the last safe spot in Serie A. Carpi is five

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# RONDON PUNISHES MATA AS MAN UNITED LOSE



**WEST BROMWICH:** Salomon Rondon inflicted a major blow upon Manchester United's Champions League qualification hopes and left Juan Mata ruing two moments of madness as West Bromwich Albion won 1-0 yesterday.

The £12 million (\$17 million, 15.5 million euros) Venezuelan international lashed home his eighth goal of the season to move West Brom to within touching distance of manager Tony Pulis's all-important 40-point mark as 10-man United's run of four successive victories came to a miserable end. Louis van Gaal's side were left fighting an uphill battle after Mata saw red for picking up two yellow cards in the space of three minutes midway through the first half.

United, whose recent run of success in all competitions had raised hope that they could still force their way into the title race, have now lost more valuable ground in the chase for a more realistic target, that of finishing in the top four and earning a Champions League spot. They paid the price for Mata's rashness as he was first yellow-carded for blocking Albion's attempt to take a quick free-kick and then took a swipe at former United team-mate Darren

The game was decided by an excellent finish from Rondon, who swiftly controlled Sebastien Pocognoli's cross before lashing a shot past David de Gea. United acquitted themselves well in the opening stages, Anthony Martial registering the first shot on target, albeit an ambitious one from long range, which Ben Foster gathered guite comfortably.

But West Brom began to build up a head of

steam, threatening through Craig Dawson and Saido Berahino. As if that was not enough of a concern to United, their problems multiplied when Mata paid the price for picking up two needless bookings.

### **MATA DECAMPS**

Having been shown a yellow card for preventing Fletcher from taking a free-kick, he then picked up a second booking for a reckless swipe at the same player, leaving referee Mike Dean with little option but to give him his marching orders. Dawson had been well off target with an early header, but that was not the case when he tried an instinctive lob from long range that left De Gea grasping at thin air as it drifted just wide of the far post.

Van Gaal shuffled his pack in an attempt to stem the tide, with Martial, Jesse Lingard and Marcus Rashford all changing positions, and it succeeded in helping United to see out the remainder of the first half without any further alarms.

Not content with that, they began the second period with even greater vigour and purpose, Lingard's bursts down the left giving them even greater encouragement.

It was Lingard who went close to breaking the deadlock when he cut in from the left and unleashed a dipping shot that brushed the roof of the net after just clearing the bar.

Little had been seen of Albion as an attacking threat after the break, but they went in front midway through the second period courtesy of Rondon's clinically taken strike.

The Baggies' record signing showed great composure to bring Pocognoli's drilled cross under control before lashing a left-foot shot past De Gea. It seemed to knock the stuffing out of United and Mata looked on forlornly from The Hawthorns' media centre as the home side pressed for a second goal.

Van Gaal's side avoided any further damage, but that was little consolation as they suffered their first Premier League defeat at West Brom. — AFP

# CHINA RULES OUT HARD-LANDING FOR ECONOMY

# Uncertain global economy poses risk to China's growth: Xu

**BEIJING:** China's economy isn't headed for a hard landing and isn't dragging on the global economy, China's top economic planner said yesterday, but uncertainty and instability in the global economy do pose a risk to the country's growth. China on Saturday acknowledged it faced tough battle to keep world's No.2 economy growing by at least 6.5 percent over the next five years while pushing hard to create more jobs and restructuring state-owned enterprises.

The comments, as Beijing kicked off its 12-day annual national parliament, underscored the challenges facing China as its economy transitions from an investment and export focused economy to one based more on services and consumption. "China will absolutely not experience a hard landing," Xu Shaoshi, head of the National Development and Reform Commission (NDRC), told reporters at a briefing. "These predictions of a hard landing are destined to come

to nothing." China's economy grew 6.9 percent in 2015, the slowest pace in a quarter of a century, but still comfortably the fastest among major economies. It has set a growth target of 6.5 percent to 7 percent for this year, introducing a band rather than a hard target as it seeks greater flexibility in juggling growth, job creation and restructuring of a host of "zombie companies" in bloated industries.

On Saturday, Premier Li Keqiang outlined a series of targets on issues such as energy consumption, job creation and inflation but few details on how they would be met.

Many investors had been beging China

Many investors had been hoping China would post an aggressive target for fiscal spending to prop growth. But the draft goal of running a fiscal deficit equivalent to 3 percent of GDP, while up from the previous year's target of 2.3 percent, disappointed some.

Ercent, disappointed some.

Xu emphasized that China will work to

improve the "efficiency" of government investment, suggesting a desire for more targeted spending. That would be a contrast to the last stimulus injection after the global financial crisis when Chinese local governments built ghost cities, roads to nowhere and airports to juice growth. China has massive foreign exchange reserves of more than \$3 trillion to tap if needed, but a sharp decline in reserves in the past 18 months as Beijing sought to support its yuan has rattled some investors. Central bank vice governor Yi Gang on Sunday reiterated Beijing will keep the yuan basically stable and there was no basis for continued depreciation.

# NEW NORMAL

The state of China's economy and Beijing's ability to manage it were key talking points at a Group of 20 finance ministers and central bankers in Shanghai last month. Li said China has

the confidence to handle the complexities both at home and abroad while pressing ahead with

"In general, I think China's economy performance has stayed at a reasonable range (since 2015)," Xu said, adding that the Chinese economy shouldn't be viewed through traditional perspectives. "First, we should look from the angle that the economy has entered the 'new normal' period," he said, in which growth rates have shifted and the economy's growth engines are changing

towards services from investment.

In the run-up to parliament, Beijing has flagged major job losses in the country's bloated coal and steel industries. But plans to reduce industrial over-capacity were unlikely to result in large-scale layoffs, Xu said. Economic growth will create more jobs and help offset the impact of capacity cuts, he said. Nonetheless, the broader world economy poses challenges to China this

year, Xu said.

year, Xu said.

"First, we estimate the slow recovery and low growth rates in the world's economy will continue for a period of time," he said. "Also we could not overlook the risks from unstable (global) financial markets, falling prices of commodities and risks of geopolitics." China also plans to launch several mixed ownership pilot programs in the oil, natural gas and rail sectors, Xu said, part of the most far-reaching reforms of its sprawling and inefficient state sector in two decades.

In September last year, China issued guidance on reforming state-owned enterprises, including the introduction of so-called mixed ownership of state firms. China has about 150,000 state-owned enterprises, managing more than 100 trillion yuan (\$15 trillion) in assets and employing over 30 million people, according to the official Xinhua news agency. — Reuters

# GERMAN ECONOMIC ENGINE THROTTLES BACK OVER 'WHAT IF' UNCERTAINTIES

**BERLIN:** Nervousness among buyers of German goods around the world - often over problems that have yet to materialize - is forcing some of the nation's small- and mid-sized manufacturers to postpone investments, and threatening to stunt economic growth.

These largely family-owned companies of the "Mittelstand", the backbone of German industry, definitely face trouble this year in major export markets, such as an economic slowdown in China and recession in Russia and Brazil. But much of the anxiety among customers is of a 'what if' nature: what if turmoil on financial markets spreads to the real economy, what if the West gets into a serious confrontation with

Russia, what if Britain leaves the European Union?

None of these things may happen, but the risk is that the fear sets off a self-fulfilling downward spiral, feeding through to the Mittelstand in the form of expected orders that never happen, or those already placed that get cancelled.

Larger German corporations - such as Daimler, BASF and ThyssenKrupp - can afford to look beyond such near-term uncertainties and are pressing ahead with investment plans.

However, Mittelstand firms with more modest financial resources make up roughly 98 percent of German export companies and they are being held back by a fall in business confidence caused by the political risks plus this year's dive on stock, energy and commodity markets.

"We're worried that we are talking ourselves into a crisis," said Josef Minster, CEO of the Schlemmer Group, a Bavarian-based automotive supplier specialised in cable protection systems. "I see a clear risk here that panic reactions on financial markets could spill over and hurt the real economy," said Minster, naming China, Russia and Brazil as the weak spots for his firm's growth prospects.

# STRONGER THAN SENTIMENT

The common feeling in the Mittelstand is that the business environment is stronger than sentiment, but this may not last. The concern is that when foreign customers postpone investment decisions, the exporters are forced to follow suit.

This in turn threatens to drag German growth below the government's 1.7 percent forecast for this year, despite a largely buoyant domestic economy. Stephan Gais, CEO of Mittelstand firm Mahr, which makes high-end measuring tools used in the auto and chemicals sectors, cited tensions between the West and Russia over the Ukraine conflict, the refugee crisis, the British referendum in June on whether to leave the EU, and general anxiety about terror attacks as risks to his business.

"If any of these geopolitical issues escalates, then things will get difficult," said Gais, who is seeing delays in investment decisions by domestic as well as foreign customers in Mahr's biggest markets: Germany, the United States and China. "We're trading from quarter to quarter," he said, adding that his plan for five percent sales growth this year was looking challenging, though still achievable. "But I'm not doing any expansionary investment at the moment."

According to a survey by the Ifo economic institute, sentiment among German manufacturers plunged last month by its largest amount since the bankruptcy of Lehman Brothers in 2008, a major event in the global financial crisis.

A breakdown for Mittelstand firms, the KfW-ifo SME Barometer, highlights the confidence problem. A sub-index measuring their expectations of future business fell for the first time since October 2014 below zero, the long-term average since 1991. And yet the firms still rated their current business as exceptionally positive.

"This ... shows that the mood is so far affected mainly by the many disturbing news reports and the concerns and fears they create, and not by actual economic trends," KfW bank analyst Klaus Borger said. Smaller 'micro-cap' companies listed on the stock market are also cautious. Of those that have reported outlooks this year, 10 gave forecasts above analysts' estimates, 32 in line with expectations, and 15 below.

By contrast, companies in the blue-chip DAX index able to take a longer view are investing in new technologies and markets they believe will grow in due course. Daimler, for example, is investing 500 million euros (\$550 million) in a battery factory in Germany for electric cars. — Reuters

# GULF MARKETS GAIN AS OIL NEARS \$39

# MIDEAST STOCK MARKETS

**DUBAI:** Firmer oil prices and a revival of global risk appetite helped lift stock markets in the Middle East yesterday, as heavyweight petrochemical firms and banks boosted Saudi Arabia's bourse in heavy trade. Moody's Investors Service put the debt ratings of Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Kuwait and Qatar on review for possible downgrade late on Friday, and cut Bahrain's rating to junk, citing low oil prices.

But many investors saw this as a belated response to old news, and focused instead on oil's rebound near \$39 a barrel in the past couple of weeks. "This is not really new news," a Jeddah-based analyst said of the Moody's action. "I believe the bottoming of oil prices will outweigh the negative impact of the cut in outlook to negative."

in outlook to negative."
Riyadh's index rose 2.9 percent in the highest volume since Jan. 20. Short-term technicals have turned positive for Saudi Arabia, which triggered a bullish right triangle by breaking its January peak last week; it closed very near its session high yesterday. Leading petrochemical producer Saudi Basic Industries gained 3.4 percent and Samba Financial Group added 4.5 percent.

Dubai's index also jumped 2.9 percent as shares in construction firm Arabtec surged

13.0 percent, after adding 8.0 percent on Thursday. They have been swinging wildly in speculative trade since exchange data at the start of last week showed former chief executive Hasan Ismaik had raised his stake in the company to 11.91 percent from 11.81 percent. Other speculative shares favoured by local traders also attracted volume, with builder Drake & Scull surging 13.1 percent to 0.48 dirhams; it is now up 66 percent from its record low in mid-January. Nine analysts polled by Thomson Reuters on the stock believe it is fairly valued, as their median price target is 0.42 dirhams.

But, in contrast to last week's rebound in Dubai's market, blue-chips also posted strong gains. Emaar Properties surged 2.6 percent and Emirates NBD added 2.5 percent.

Abu Dhabi's benchmark gained 3.1 percent with volumes concentrated in mid-cap companies including Eshraq Properties and Dana Gas, the two most heavily traded stocks, which climbed 5.4 and 3.9 percent respectively. But the banking sector, which was largely dormant last week, was active on Sunday with heavyweights National Bank of Abu Dhabi and First Gulf Bank jumping 2.3 and 4.7 percent. — Reuters

# YEMEN'S FOOD CRISIS DEEPENS AS BANKS CUT CREDIT FOR SHIPMENTS

# BANKS WARY OF GUARANTEEING PAYMENTS FOR FOOD CARGOES

LONDON/ABU DHABI: Banks have cut credit lines for traders shipping food to war-torn Yemen, where ports have been battlegrounds and the financial system is grinding to a halt, choking vital supplies to an impoverished country that could face famine.

Lenders are increasingly unwilling to offer letters of credit - which guarantee that a buyer's payment to a seller will be received on time - for cargoes to a country plagued by a civil war between the government and Houthi militia as well as an Al-Qaeda insurgency, say banking and trading sources.

"Western international banks no longer feel comfortable processing payments and are not willing to take the risk," said an international commodities trading source active in Yemen.

"What this means is traders are saddled with even more risks and have to effectively guarantee entire cargoes, usually millions of dollars, before the prospect of getting paid," said the source, who declined to be named, citing security concerns. "There are just more and more obstacles now to bringing goods into Yemen."

Traders that procure food for Yemen are mostly smaller, private firms based locally or regionally that buy the goods from international

The situation has worsened rapidly in the past month after Yemen's central bank stopped providing favourable exchange rates for local traders buying rice and sugar from global markets, say the sources, further hindering trading of food, which accounts for a large proportion of the country's imports. The decision to limit such rates to wheat and medicine - deemed more nationally crucial - was a bid to preserve fastdwindling foreign currency reserves.

The financing difficulties have been one of the factors behind falling shipments to Yemen, according to the sources. In January, around 77 ships berthed at ports in Yemen, according to UN data, down from around 100 ships in March last year - when the civil war escalated - and a far cry from the hundreds of ships that called every month in previous years. The consequences could be grave for the Arab peninsula's poorest country, which the United Nations says is "on the brink of catastrophe". It relies on seaborne imports for almost all its food and 21 million out of 26 million people are in need of humanitarian support, with over half the population suffering

from malnutrition. The war has seen a Saudi-led Arab coalition intervene in late March a year ago to seek to restore the internationally recognized government of President Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi, battling the Iranian-allied Houthis and forces loyal to former President Ali Abdullah Saleh. Mohammed AlShamery, an official at Yemen's sole sugar refinery, in the northern city of Hodaida on the Red Sea, said the credit and currency curbs had added to the problems of bringing cargoes into the country. The process had already been complicated by deteriorating security as well as inspections of vessels by Arab coalition warships hunting for weapons bound for Houthi fighters.

"You have to be in constant touch with the shippers and reassure them that everything is fine and sometimes send pictures of the area so they know it's safe," AlShamery said.

# **PRICES RISE**

A European banking source said some banks had decided to completely withdraw from offering credit lines on food trades to Yemen. "Even if a bank is willing to process a payment, which relates to food, they have to be careful," the

Trading sources said banks that had been involved in Yemen's food trade have included Commerzbank, Deutsche Bank and HSBC as well as regional Middle East banks. Commerzbank and Deutsche Bank declined to comment. HSBC said it continued to support customers trading across the Middle East and North Africa region including Yemen "subject to relevant regulatory and commercial controls".

Yemeni banks are also feeling the pressure. Aidros Mohammed, an official with state-run National Bank of Yemen, said since the end of last year it had stopped opening letters of credit for the trade of goods in general "as outside banks have stopped dealing with us".

Watheq Ali Hamed, the manager of a store in Sanaa, said the decision by the central bank regarding rice and sugar purchases would be felt by ordinary Yemenis. "Prices are already going up because of the war and the rise in the cost of securing the goods," he said. "The full effects of that decision will be felt going forward. Luckily, we still have some stocks."

Slowing of imports and rising prices could pose grave problems for Yemen, where areas are at risk of famine. The country lacks sufficient seasonal rains, has limited access to farming areas and facing rising costs of agricultural supplies, a report by a U.N. food agency said in January.

# PORT FLASHPOINTS

More than 6,000 people have been killed has seen the Houthis gain control of the capital Sanaa. Major ports have been flashpoints for fighting including the southern gateway of Aden, which has been gripped by violence since Hadi supporters seized it from Houthi forces in July. There have also been Saudi-led air strikes close to the port of Hodaida.

Adding to the turmoil, Al Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) has been expanding its presence in Yemen; in February it took control of the southern town of Ahwar, months after seizing the major port city of Mukalla to the east.

Two banking sources in Yemen said restrictions on moving money abroad due to the conflict was adding to trade financing difficulties. "We have a big problem in transferring money abroad ... so we cannot open letters of credit for traders to import," one Yemeni banker said. Trading and banking sources also said uncertainty over who was in control of Yemen's central bank - given its headquarters in Sanaa - was adding to lenders' caution. One Middle East banking source said some institutions were steering clear of transactions while Sanaa was still under Houthi control. — Reuters

### **US dollar stabilizes** against KD at 0.300

**KUWAIT:** The exchange rate of the US dollar against the Kuwaiti dinar stabilized at KD 0.300, while the euro rose to reach KD 0.330 compared to the exchange rates for Thursday, said a statement by the Central Bank of Kuwait (CBK) yesterday. According to the CBK, the exchange rate of the Sterling pound went up to KD 0.427 and the Swiss franc rose to KD 0.302. Exchange rate of the Japanese yen remained the same at KD 0.002.

### Egypt CB to hold \$500m **FX** auction

CAIRO: Egypt's central bank said yesterday it would hold an exceptional auction for \$500 million to cover imports of strategic goods, pumping more foreign exchange into an economy that has been starved of dollars. Egypt, which relies heavily on imports, hasn't been able to recover since a popular uprising in 2011 toppled autocrat Hosni Mubarak, driving tourists and foreign investors away - major sources of hard currency. The central bank has been keeping the pound at 7.7301 per dollar, but the currency has been depreciating rapidly on the black market over the past week. It reached 9.50 to the dollar on the black market on Thursday. The central bank normally sells no more than \$40 million at its regular forex auctions, which are held three times a week. Egypt's reserves have dropped from \$36 billion in 2011 to \$16.53 billion at the end of February.

### **IDB** issues sukuk worth \$1.5 billion

JEDDAH: The Islamic Development Bank (IDB) has announced a five-year sukuk issuance of \$1.5 billion, with annual revenue of 1.775 percent, the IDB said on Saturday. The move is part of the IDB's mid-term sukuk issuance program, which hits a total of \$25 billion, the IDB added in the statement. The issuance was arranged by Emirates NBD Capital, Boubyan Bank, Gulf International Bank CIMB, JP Morgan, Natixis and Standard Chartered. It will be listed in the London, Malaysia and Nasdaq Dubai stock exchanges. A senior IDB official expressed pleasure over the issuance that follows previous ones which realized success, and a record profit margin for the sukuk. Buying orders started on Wednesday, March 2, as soon as official pricing was announced, 50-55 basic points. It was earlier announced that the orders were worth more than \$1.5 billion from investors, of which \$243.8 million came from the joint lead arrangers and related parties.

# EGYPT NAMES NEW **HEAD FOR AGRICULTURE** QUARANTINE AUTHORITY

CAIRO: Egypt has appointed a new head of its agriculture quarantine authority, the ministry of agriculture said yesterday, replacing Saad Moussa, a figure who has been at the centre of a controversy over the country's wheat import requirements. As head of the agricultural quarantine agency Saad Moussa imposed a zero tolerance policy on ergot, a common grains fungus, a policy at odds with the ministry of agriculture and supply backing a more common international standard that allows trace levels.

"Essam Fayed the minister of agriculture has appointed Ibrahim Ahmed Imbabi, head of the Plant Pathology Research Institute, to head the central administration of the agricultural quarantine authority," a statement from the ministry said.

Many traders, who say guaranteeing zero ergot is impossible, have declined in recent months to make offers in state wheat tenders, saying it was too costly to risk having their shipments later turned away by Moussa's quarantine authority. The disrupted wheat tenders have raised the possibility of a shortage of grain which could pose a political problem for President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi as the impoverished population relies on highly subsidized bread. The ministry said Imbabi's appointment was part of a plan to "restructure the ministry of agriculture and its various sectors, to develop and improve its performance". — Reuters

# BANKERS JOSTLE TO BE JUNIOR AS UK accoúntability ruĺes kick in

New rules can hold bosses responsible for bank misconduct

wrongdoing at British banks is deterring some bankers from taking on senior management roles and even prompting big-hitters to play down their own importance, say legal and compliance experts. Public anger that so few senior bankers were punished after taxpayers bailed out the industry in the financial crisis, or for scandals such as Libor and currency-market rigging, has led to the rules which make it easier to hold them to account.

The Senior Managers Regime (SMR) from today replaces a system that UK lawmakers criticised for giving illusory control over individuals with little prospect of enforcement action.

A step change in banking rules, it will allow regulators to pin blame on named people rather than just firms, which lawyers said has triggered anxiety among top bankers. "I have had some clients with staff resistant to being a senior manager, worried they are going to be kept awake at night about what their team is doing, and if something goes wrong, will they be the scapegoat," said Sarah Henchoz, an employment partner at Allen & Overy law firm.

"One thing I have seen that does make me smile is the wonderful term used by some firms that want to 'juniorise' positions," Gould said. "It may be more wishful thinking than anything else."

One person familiar with how the SMR is being introduced said regulators were aware of this and were pushing back against banks that fail what the person described as the "sniff test" - or too many senior managers saying that they did not have full responsibility over teams but simply reported to other more senior managers. But such attempts at creating a chain of senior managers to blur direct accountability were not widespread, the source said.

Britain's Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and the Bank of England's Prudential Regulation Authority, which will both enforce the regime, declined to com-

Asked if bankers were balking at the new rules, Simon Hills, an executive director at the British Bankers' Association, said the SMR was regarded in the industry as a key element to restoring trust in banking. "I talk to senior managers at banks who say it's been a useful exercise, enabling banks to check and confirm they have got the right people in the right roles and clarify job descriptions where necessary."

# **EMAIL TRAIL**

The United States and other European countries have not gone as far as the SMR by holding senior managers personally responsible by law. Requirements in the rules for senior managers to demonstrate they took steps to prevent or stop rulebreaking will also prompt bosses to document all delegation of tasks and to archive emails to help keep them in the clear if misconduct is uncovered, lawyers

"You need to be clear that you have a document trail on how you delegated responsibility, how you supervised key parts of the business, that you know in five years' time exactly what you did," said A&O's Henchoz. Adrian Crawford, employment partner at Kingsley Napley, which advises individuals in the financial sector, said more senior managers might have been held responsible for the Libor-rigging scandal if the SMR had existed in past years. — Reuters

# EX-BOE CHIEF SAYS EURO A 'VERY SERIOUS PROBLEM'

**LONDON:** The European single currency is a serious problem for Britain whether or not the country leaves the European Union, a former governor of the Bank of England said yesterday.

Mervyn King said that even though Britain does not use the euro, "we are influenced and affected by what goes on in the euro area." He says the euro has been economically "a, if not disaster, very serious

Asked on BBC television if that meant Britain should leave the EU, King said Sunday: "I don't think you can draw that conclusion." He said "in or out," Britain would have close ties to the eurozone.

The euro area is our biggest trading partner, that's going to carry on being the case and therefore it does matter to us what goes on there," said King, who now sits in Parliament's unelected upper chamber, the House of Lords. Nineteen of the EU's 28 members use the euro, which has suffered instability since the 2008 financial crisis hammered the currency's debt-bur-

dened weaker members, particularly

Those who want to leave the EU say the crisis shows Britain would be better off outside the bloc.

Economic issues have dominated the debate ahead of Britain's June 23 referendum on whether to stay in the EU. London Mayor Boris Johnson, a leader of the "out" campaign, said yesterday that after leaving Britain would be able to negotiate a freetrade deal with the EU while escaping the bloc's "top-down legislation and regula-

But German Finance Minister Wolfgang Schaeuble said countries that wanted access to the EU's single market "still have to pay into the budget of the community and they have to accept the free movement of people" from EU member states. "So actually they have all the disadvantages of the common market and they are not involved in the decision-making process of the internal single market," he

# GREEK PM BLASTS IMF 'STALLING TACTICS'

**ATHENS:** Greek Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras yesterday said the IMF was employing "stalling tactics" and "arbitrary" estimates to hold up a reforms review crucial to the country's eco-

The leftist PM said the Washingtoncounter-productive cuts that failed to take into account the improved performance of Greece's economy. "The review will be completed soon in spite of the IMF's stalling tactics," Tsipras told his party's central committee.

"For the first time, there is substantial convergence... between the Greek side and European institutions," he said. Greece and the EU now see eye to eye on the pace of reforms, the state of the 2016 budget and fiscal requirements to 2018, he said.

In contrast, the International Monetary Fund had "unrealistic expectations" "unrevised and erroneous calculations," Tsipras said.

The Greek economy in 2015 saw output fall by just 0.2 percent, after an August forecast of a drop of up to 2.0 percent, the government says.

Athens also closed the year with a small primary surplus instead of an expected primary deficit, Tsipras said. "Numbers are numbers...this is not a technocratic disagreement, it is a political disagreement," the PM said.

Greece's international creditors-the EU, European Central Bank and International Monetary Fund-completed a first phase of the review nearly a month ago, but there has been little progress since. Athens is hoping that a meeting of the 19-nation eurozone based global lender was bent on today will authorise senior EU-IMF auditors to return later in the week. Athens is eager to complete the reforms review to unlock debt relief promised by its European peers. But the IMF's European zone head last month warned against "over-optimistic assumptions (which) will soon cause fears (of a Greek euro exit) to resurface once again and stifle the investment climate."

A major sticking point is a pension reform planned by Tsipras' leftist government which the IMF has found insufficient. The IMF worked with the EU on two previous bailouts for Greece since 2010 but the Washington-based lender said it would not participate in the third rescue plan without credible reforms and an EU agreement to ease Greece's debt burden.

In July, Greece accepted a threeyear, 86-billion-euro (\$94 billion) European Union bailout that saved it from crashing out of the eurozone, but imposed strict conditions such as fresh tax cuts and pay cuts. — AFP

# OBAMA CHEERS ECONOMY AS 'PRETTY DARN GREAT

WASHINGTON: Once reluctant to hype the US economy's slow climb out of recession, President Barack Obama now is in cheerleader mode. "America's pretty darn great right now," Obama told reporters Friday as he celebrated a strong jobs report that he said proved Republicans' "doomsday rhetoric" is little more than "fantasy."

Obama's brief remarks were a striking turn for a president who for most of his seven years in office has put on a sober face every time he spoke about the economy. Years of slow jobs growth and stagnant wages made the president and his team wary of seeming out of step with the plight of Americans

still feeling the aftereffects of the recession. Those concerns seemed a thing of the past on

Friday. Hours after a new Labor Department report showed employers added 242,000 workers in February, Obama called reporters to the Roosevelt Room at the White House, and he didn't hold back. "Our businesses have created jobs every single month since I signed that job-killing Obamacare bill," Obama said, digging at the Republicans' favorite name for his health-care law. Obama didn't name names but showed he's been following the especiallv combative GOP nomination fight. He seemed ready to get off the sidelines. The president said he looks forward to "forcefully" making his case for changing the conversation to a debate over investing in education and infrastructure and increasing wages, "not fantasy, not name-calling." — AP

# GEORGIANS FORM HUMAN CHAIN TO PROTEST TALKS WITH GAZPROM

**TBILISI:** Thousands of Georgians formed a human chain stretching for about 7 kilometers (4 miles) through the capital yesterday to protest negotiations between their government and the Russian natural gas monopoly, Gazprom. The demonstrators, supporters of the main opposition party, said they fear that buying gas from state-controlled Gazprom would make the former Soviet republic dependent on Moscow. But even before yesterday's protest the opposition appeared close to winning its case. The government announced Friday that it had signed a deal with neighboring Azerbaijan to increase gas supplies enough to fully cover Georgian demand. Energy Minister Kakha Kaladze previously had justified the negotiations with Gazprom by saying Azerbaijan did not have the technical ability to supply more gas, but he said this problem has now been overcome.

"They tried to deceive us by saying it was not technically possible to increase gas supplies from Azerbaijan," David Bakradze, the opposition leader in parliament, said yesterday. "But they failed because people didn't believe them and forced the government to do everything possible to receive additional fuel from Azerbaijan. We will not allow Georgia to be under Russia's control."

A related issue is how Gazprom compensates Georgia for the gas transported across Georgian territory to Armenia. In the past, Georgia has taken 10 percent of the gas, but Gazprom recently demanded that Georgia accept payment, apparently expecting that this would force Georgia to buy Russian gas.

Kaladze said Gazprom has now agreed to leave the previous barter arrangement in place, but the contract still needs to be signed. The Georgian government says it has

received 200 million cubic meters of Russian natural gas per year in return for the transit. Under the new agreement with Socar, Azerbaijan's state oil and gas producer, Georgia will receive an additional 500 million cubic meters per year. — AP

# ECB RATE MEETING, CHINESE DATA IN FOCUS

# **GLOBAL ECONOMY WEEK AHEAD**

**FRANKFURT:** The European Central Bank is almost certain to ease policy next week as depressed commodity prices raise the risk of deflation, while a string of data from China will offer clues about the extent of the recent emerging market slowdown. Growth in most key economies has slowed this year as states such as China to Brazil attempt to rebalance, weighing on global demand and sending deflationary waves around the world through sharply lower oil and metals prices.

Already struggling with ultralow inflation after years of crisis, the ECB has all but promised policy easing on Thursday but the devil will lie in the

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details. A small 10 basis point cut to push its deposit rate deeper into negative territory is a foregone conclusion while some type of adjustment of the bank's 1.5 trillion euro asset purchase program is also near certain.

But each option on the table comes with side effects and limited functionality as monetary policy is deep in unconventional territory, making exotic decisions less likely given the difficulty of aligning the interest of 19 countries and 25 policymakers.

"Negative Interest Rate Policy (NIRP) seems to be all the rage in central bank circles these days," Morgan Stanley said in a note to clients, arguing that such policies do not actually help bank lend-

"There are concerns amongst investors that the negative deposit rate will undermine the effectiveness of the ECB's quantitative easing," Morgan Stanley added. "This is because it effectively introduces a tax on excess bank reserves, i.e., effectively a tax on QE itself."

A small majority of analysts also expect a 10 billion euro increase in monthly asset purchases while others predict an expansion of QE into new asset classes or a fresh push for targeted long term refinancing operations. The ECB could also remove its self-imposed limits not to buy bonds

yielding less than the deposit rate, a contentious move as it would mean certain losses on some assets, while a range of technical changes are possible.

### CHINA

The outlook for the United States was brighter, with Friday's non-farm payrolls figures easing fears that the world's largest economy was heading into recession and potentially allowing the Federal Reserve to gradually raise interest rates this year.

However, China's faltering outlook will remain a top concern for policymakers around the globe and investor focus will be fixed on the annual meeting of China's parliament, which must try to engineer a huge economic shift towards services and consumption and away from basic manufacturing. As around 3,000 delegates from the National People's Congress meet in Beijing, a wide range of fresh data, including on reserves and trade, are expected to point to a further loss of momentum and capital flight, supporting expectations for more measures to prop up sagging growth.

"Government policy is being set to guide China along a narrow path: enough pain to force through reform and restructuring, close overcapacity, improve efficiency of investment, etc., but not enough to seriously damage job creation," Commonwealth Bank said.

Foreign trade data are expected to make for sombre reading, reflecting persistent weakness in demand at home and abroad which is holding back industrial production and keeping a lid on commodity prices. Imports are seen down 10 percent in February, a improvement from a January's 19 percent drop, while exports are seen declining by 12.5 percent following an 11.2 percent drop in January.

New lending is also seen lower after a surge a month earlier but money supply growth is seen steady, a figure closely analyzed by markets to gauge if China can arrest the slowdown in investments.

February foreign reserves data will also be closely watched, with most expecting a slowdown in the exit of funds after exceptionally high outflows in January.

"Capital is flowing out of China at an unprecedented pace," Nordea analysts Amy Y. Zhuang said. "\$850bn is estimated to have left the country since mid-2014."

"Even huge FX reserves like China's would seem insufficient if the pace of depletion continues," Zhuang added. The Bank of Canada also meets next week and will likely keep rates on hold, taking comfort in stabilizing global markets, a slightly better-than-forecast fourth-quarter GDP reading and a modest rebound in commodity prices

British industry data are also expected to generate interest after output fell 1.1 percent in December, its sharpest monthly drop since 2012. January figures are expected to show a 0.6 percent increase, taking the annualized growth to 0.2 percent. — Reuters

# DOLLAR DROPS AS WEAK WAGES ECLIPSE JOB GROWTH

# **NBK MONEY MARKETS REPORT**

**KUWAIT:** Last week, mixed economic data from major economies dictated the movement in the foreign exchange market. The market also revolved around the highly awaited US Job report for further indications over the health of the US economy and the Fed's path. Additionally, global equities were up last week after China cut its reserve requirement to boost its slowing economy and rising oil prices lifted investor's sentiments.

On the foreign exchange side, the Dollar started the week on a strong footing and managed to hold gains on the back of a positive ISM manufacturing figure and a strong ADP employment report. However, the greenback lost its footing following weak jobless claims on Thursday, fuelling concerns over the health of the labor market. On Friday, employment data continued to come back mixed with nonfarm payrolls increasing better than expected but wages decreased unexpectedly. While the job market seems to be in good health, bigger wage gains are needed to help inflation move closer to the Fed's target. The Dollar Index opened the week at 98.148 and reached a high of 98.582. The Index failed to hold on to these gains and dropped to a low of 97.019 after the jobs data was released.

The Euro opened the week at 1.0934. The currency led the way lower as weaker than expected Eurozone inflation increased the possibility of further easing by the ECB. The news pushed the Euro to reach a low of 1.0826. Meanwhile, the currency managed to erase its losses against the greenback and reach a high of 1.1043 following soft data from the US. The currency closed the week higher at 1.1006 following the US figures. The Sterling pound gained considerably as profit taking pushed the currency higher despite weak economic data and looming "Brexit" worries. The currency opened the week at 1.3871 and rose gradually towards the end of the week. On Friday, the Pound reached a high of 1.4248 amid weakness in the US Dollar. The currency closed the week at 1.4226.

The Japanese Yen traded in a volatile manner last week. The currency gained strength amid disappointing figures from China's manufacturing sector. However, the pair failed to sustain gains against the US dollar as comments from the BoJ Deputy Governor indicated further efforts to derail inflation are needed. The USD/JPY closed the week at 113.75.

The Australian dollar opened the week on a strong footing as risk appetite improved following a better than expected GDP reading. The currency then extended its gains against the greenback following a narrower trade deficit and an upbeat services index. The Aussie opened the week at 0.7126 and managed to reach a high of 0.7443. Finally, the currency closed the week at 0.7441.

On the commodities side, oil rallied last week as investors continue to estimate whether OPEC will introduce a production freeze later this month in order to curb the downturn in the oil industry. West Texas crude reached a high of 36.34 and closed the week at 36.33. Meanwhile, gold initially range traded between 1225 and 1248. The metal then broke higher on Thursday following disappointing data from the US. Gold reached a high of 1279.88 and closed at 1258.95.

# Pending home sales drop

US pending home sales fell unexpectedly in January as price increases and lower inventory hit demand. The National Association of Realtors said its pending home sales index fell 2.5 percent last month versus expectations of a 0.5 percent increase in January. Meanwhile, December sales were revised upwards to 0.9 percent from the previous 0.1 percent. Pending sales point to the future direction of the housing market as they measure purchases at the time a contract is signed, rather than at closing.

# **US manufacturing stabilizes**

Manufacturing activity in the US contracted again in February, but at a slower pace than in the previous month. In a report, the Institute for Supply Management said its index of purchasing managers inched up to 49.5 last month from a reading of 48.2 in January. Analysts had expected the manufacturing PMI to rise to 48.5 in February. Comments from the panel indicate a more positive view of demand than in January, as 12 of our 18 industries report an increase in new orders, while four industries report a decrease in new

Service sector activity in the US grew at the slowest pace in almost two years in February. The Institute of Supply Management said its non-manufacturing PMI fell to 53.4 from 53.5 in January. Analysts had expected the index to tick down to 53.2. The downbeat data indicated that weakness in the US manufacturing sector is spreading to the

US private employers added 214,000 jobs in February, above economists' expectations. Economists had forecast that the ADP National Employment Report would show a gain of 190,000 jobs, with estimates ranging from 160,000

The number of Americans filing for unemployment benefits rose last week, but remained in territory associated with a firming labor market. Initial jobless claims rose to 278,000 from the previous week's total of 272,000 the Labor Department said. Economists had forecast claims rising to 271,000 last week. Claims have now remained below the 300,000 mark, which is associated with strong labor market conditions, for 52 straight weeks.

# Mixed employment data

The Bureau of Labor Statistics released mixed numbers Friday as labor increased better than projected but wages unexpectedly declined. Employers added 242,000 workers in February following a 172,000 rise in January while the jobless rate stayed unchanged at 4.9 percent. Conversely, average hourly earnings declined 0.1 percent, or 3 cents, for

# **Eurozone unemployment**

The euro zone's unemployment rate fell to the lowest level in more than four years in January, fueling optimism over the health of the region's economy, official data showed on Tuesday. In a report, Eurostat said that the eurozone's unemployment rate fell to a seasonally adjusted 10.3 percent from 10.4 percent in December. This is the lowest rate recorded in the euro area since August 2011. Analysts had expected the jobless rate to hold steady at 10.4 percent

# Eurozone falls back

The eurozone fell back into deflation in February for the first time in five months. Consumer prices fell 0.2 percent from a year earlier after rising 0.3 percent in January. It was the first negative inflation figure since September, when prices fell 0.1 percent. The drop was largely due to falling energy costs, which were 8 percent lower in the year to February. The weak data adds more pressure on the ECB to

ease monetary policy again at its March 10 meeting.

Manufacturing activity in the UK expanded at the slowest rate in nearly three years in February, as output growth eased sharply, industry data showed on Tuesday. In a report, Markit research group said that its UK manufacturing PMI fell to a seasonally adjusted 50.8 last month from a reading of 52.9 in January. Meanwhile, analysts had expected the

index to inch down to 52.2 in February. Similarly, the UK's construction sector activity expanded at the slowest pace in ten months in February, underlining concerns over the economy and dimming the case for higher interest rates. The country's construction purchasing managers' index fell to a seasonally adjusted 54.2 last month from a reading of 55.0 in January. Economists had expected the index to inch up to 55.5 in February.

Additionally, the Services Purchasing Managers Index declined to 52.7 last month from a reading of 55.6 in January that was its highest reading since last November. Analysts had expected the index to dip to only 55.1 in February its lowest level in nearly three years.

# China's manufacturing PMI declines

China's factory gauge extended its stretch of deteriorating conditions to a record seven months while a measure of services fell to the weakest in seven years, underscoring the challenge for policy makers as they seek to cut overcapacity in manufacturing without derailing growth. The manufacturing purchasing manager's index dropped to 49 in February, missing estimates of 49.4. It hasn't been weaker since January 2009. Numbers below 50 indicate conditions worsened.

In a sign China's slowdown is spreading, the non-manufacturing PMI, which has been outperforming the factory measure, fell to the lowest level since December 2008. The Non-manufacturing PMI fell to 52.7 from 53.5.

# **Reserve Bank of Australia**

The Reserve Bank of Australia kept their cash rate unchanged at 2 percent leaving interest rates at historically low levels. In his statement, RBA Governor Glenn Stevens said low interest rates were supporting demand, while tougher lending standards were helping to contain risks in the housing market. In terms of further easing, the RBA mentioned it is appropriate for monetary policy to be accommodative and continued low inflation would provide scope for easier policy, should that be appropriate to lend support to demand.

# Australia GDP and trade balance

The Australian Bureau of Statistics released positive numbers that aided the AUD's climb against the dollar to 7 month highs. Australia's economic growth was higher than expected at 0.6 percent for the December quarter and 3 percent for the year. The two biggest contributors to growth for the guarter were consumer spending, which added 0.5 percentage points, and an increase in inventories, which added 0.2 percentage points. Australia's seasonally adjusted trade balance narrowed in January to -2.9B from an expected -3.2B with value of imports declining to 1.1 percent while exports rose 1.1 percent. AUD/USD jumped from 0.7172 to a high of 0.7430 after the numbers were released.

# British retailers invite RIVAL BRANDS TO FILL THEIR EMPTY SPACES

LONDON: As online deliveries surge and shop sales fall, Britain's retailers are looking to refit their once bustling superstores with new attractions such as rivals' fashion brands to fill empty spaces and keep shoppers coming through the door. In a shift in strategy aimed at making the space profitable and avoiding store closures, retailers such as Tesco have also started experimenting with gyms and children's play areas to entertain

"You've got more choice. It's a bit like a shopping mall where you can come and look at different things," said healthcare worker Margaret O'Regan, who was browsing clothes from the privately-held Dorothy Perkins, Burton and Evans brands in a huge Tesco store in Woolwich, south east London.

The brands have 20,000 square feet of the store's 120,000 sq ft, replacing space previously taken up by Tesco's toys, stationery and technology offer, some of which are now

only available on its website. In the four months since the brands went in, shopper numbers at the Woolwich store

have risen. A Tesco spokesman said the changes at Woolwich were illustrative of Tesco Chief Executive Dave Lewis' strategy to turn around the business, giving shoppers more choice so they start to see superstores as the most convenient way to shop again. "We are always looking at new ways our stores can meet the needs of local customers. We're pleased with the feedback from customers in Woolwich who tell us they like the store's

convenient range of fashion options," he said. Thousands of small shops have disappeared from British towns in recent years, unable to compete with the lower costs and prices of online outfits and bluechip retailers such as Tesco and Marks & Spencer could join the exodus. "The UK is very advanced in terms of online shopping," said Neil Saunders, managing director of retail research firm Conlumino. "As other regions catch-up with that they will experience similar problems and similar issues."

In the UK online sales as a percentage of total sales rose to 15.2 percent in 2015 from 13.5 percent in 2014, according to the Centre for Retail Research, compared with 11.6 percent in Germany, 8.0 percent in France and just 2.5 percent in Italy.

# **UNDER ONE ROOF**

Britain's supermarket sector alone added around 35 million square feet between 2007 and 2014 even as online shopping rose and the digital shift looks unstoppable.

Sainsbury's, Britain's second biggest supermarket, has acknowledged that it now has around 6 percent excess space, or about 1.5 million sq ft.

A big part of the rationale for its 1.3 billion pounds proposed takeover of Argosowner Home Retail is to bring Argos concessions into its stores to absorb this space.

"The coming together of the two organizations would allow us to optimize the space and optimize the space quickly," said Sainsbury's Chief Executive Mike Coupe. The Argos concessions will complement other moves by Sainsbury's to exploit underutilised space through existing partnerships with Jessops, the photographic shop, and Timpsons, the shoe repair and key cutting firm. Tesco has also struck deals for third party outlets with firms such as Sports Direct, Mothercare, Claire's Accessories and Sock Shop and is testing gyms and soft play areas in some stores. Similarly Wal-Mart's Asda recently agreed a deal to give space over to Decathlon, the sports equipment and sports-

Matthew Hopkinson director of retail property experts The Local Data Company expects a proliferation of retail tie-ups. He says store groups are asking themselves: "What are the other things that you can bring in under the roof that make customers feel happier and therefore spend more?"

# **CLOSURES**

If retailers can't make stores profitable the alternative is closure. Tesco has closed 61 stores since Lewis became CEO in 2014, while Morrisons, Britain's No. 4 grocer, has closed 21 supermarkets and plans to close seven more, saying it can't see a way to make them profitable.

Analysts say Marks & Spencer, the country's biggest clothing retailer is ripe for a major store rationalization.

In its Christmas quarter M&S grew online sales by 21 percent and although it did not break out general merchandise sales for its stores only, analysts have estimated a yearon-year decline of over 8 percent.

The firm has been tinkering with its near 900 UK stores, dedicating a little more space to the faster growing food over clothes. There has been speculation that M&S, whose clothing offer is entirely own brand though it does sell some third-party food items, could bring in rival clothing brands. This has, however, been dismissed by CEO Marc Bolland, who will be replaced by Steve Rowe in April. A spokeswoman for M&S declined to comment. —Reuters

# US COMMERCE DEPT TO PLACE RESTRICTIONS ON CHINA'S ZTE

set to place export restrictions on Chinese telecoms equipment maker ZTE Corp for allegedly violating U.S. export controls on Iran, according to documents seen by Reuters.

The restrictions will make it difficult for the company to acquire U.S. products by requiring ZTE's suppliers to apply for an export licence before shipping any American-made equipment or parts to ZTE. According to a Commerce Department notice that will be published next week in the U.S. Federal Register, the licence applications generally will be denied. The restrictions will take effect Tuesday, Reuters has learned, and apply to any company worldwide that wants to ship U.S.-made products to ZTE Corp in China. Those companies are not the target of the export curbs on ZTE.

"This is a significant new burden on trade with ZTE," a senior official at the Commerce Department told Reuters. The official declined to comment on whether the U.S. government might take further action

A spokesman for ZTE, based in Shenzhen, China, could not be reached for immediate

LONDON: The US Commerce Department is comment. The company can appeal the action.

> The Commerce Department investigated ZTE for alleged export-control violations following reports by Reuters in 2012 that the company had signed contracts to ship millions of dollars worth of hardware and software from some of America's best-known tech firms to Iran's largest telecom carrier, Telecommunication Co of Iran (TCI), and a unit of the consortium that controls it.

> The US product makers - which included Microsoft Corp, IBM, Oracle Corp and Dell Inc have all said they were not aware of the Iranian contracts. It is not clear if any of these companies still do business with ZTE.

> Washington has long banned the sale of US-made tech products to Iran. The Commerce Department's investigation focused on whether ZTE had acquired American products through front companies and then shipped them to Iran, a violation of US sanctions.

> Commerce Department investigators obtained internal ZTE documents - some marked by the company "Top Secret" - outlining an alleged sanctions-busting scheme. Reuters reviewed some of the documents.

**SCHEME** 

The senior Commerce Department official declined to comment on whether ZTE had carried through with the alleged scheme. The day after the first Reuters article was published in March 2012, a ZTE spokesman said the company would "curtail" its business in Iran. The company later issued a statement

"ZTE no longer seeks new customers in Iran and limits business activities with existing customers." (http://www.reuters.com/article/usiran-telecoms-idUSBRE82L0B820120322) (http://www.reuters.com/article/zte-iran-aryacell-idUSL3E8FA4MS20120410)

What effect the new export restrictions will have on ZTE's current global business is not clear. One undated internal ZTE document obtained by Commerce Department investigators and reviewed by Reuters states: "Our company has many technologies and components that came from suppliers in the US" It also states: "Lots of chips or software used in the products of our company is from US suppliers."

One of ZTE's websites also states that several major US tech companies, including Microsoft, Intel Corp, IBM and Honeywell

International Inc, are "key strategic partners of ZTE." The terms of the partnerships are not

A spokeswoman for Microsoft said the company had a licensing agreement with ZTE but could not confirm if the Chinese company purchases other products, such as software. The other U.S. companies did not respond to requests for immediate com-

The undated internal ZTE document also describes a proposal overseen by the company's legal department that describes ways to export American products subject to U.S. sanctions by using shell companies to avoid getting caught. "The biggest advantage" of one method is that it will make it "harder for the US government to trace it or investigate the real flow of the controlled commodities," the document states.

In its planned action against ZTE, the Commerce Department cites the proposal, stating that the company "planned and organized a scheme to establish, control, and use a series of 'detached' companies to illicitly re-export controlled items to Iran in violation of US export control laws." It is not clear if the alleged scheme was carried through.

### **EXPORT CONTROL RISKS**

Another internal ZTE document from August 2011 that discusses "US export control risks" facing the company allegedly was signed by several top ZTE officials, including Shi Lirong, its president.

The document, marked by the company "Top Secret" and "No spreading abroad without permission of ZTE", begins "Dear company leaders". It states that ZTE "has on-going projects in all five major embargoed countries - Iran, Sudan, North Korea, Syria, and Cuba. All of these projects depend on USprocured items to some extent, so export control obstacles have arisen."

The document goes on to cite "other risks" to ZTE, including its operations in the United States. "R&D employees at the US Research Centers often travel between China and the US, carrying R&D data," it states, in an apparent reference to research and development. "This already severely violates the law." The document does not specify what law may have been violated. The company "needs to take preventative measures immediately, otherwise will face the risk of being investigated anytime," the document states. — Reuters

"There is more information available in 2016 than in any year since the founding of the country."

Although law enforcement has growing expectations about using technology to thwart criminals, that type of power is too broad, Black added. "If they are seeking a level of total surveillance capability, I don't see a compromise available," he said. — AFP

# STREAM PS4 GAMES TO YOUR PC OR MAC WITH NEXT SYSTEM UPDATE


NEW YORK: One of the PS4's most useful features-in-home remote streaming over a highspeed router-will finally be widely available without the need for proprietary Sony hardware soon. Sony announced on Tuesday that PS4 System Update version 3.5 will bring Remote Play to Windows and Macintosh computers. While the system update will launch in beta tomorrow, the streaming feature won't be available until a full release expected later in the month.

Until now, Remote Play has only been available on Sony's own PlayStation Vita and PlayStation TV hardware, as well as certain Sony Xperia phones (Update: we forgot about the phones when this was originally posted. Ars regrets the error). With the portable Vita all but dead in a tough mobile marketplace and the PlayStation TV in the process of being discontinued, Sony now seems willing to expand this useful feature to a much wider set of general computing devices.

Meanwhile, last year, Microsoft introduced the ability to stream Xbox One games from an in-home network to any Windows 10 computer, a feature that we found surprisingly robust in tests. Sony's new Remote Play expansion goes a bit further than Microsoft's in also allowing Mac owners to get in on the streaming.

Steam has allowed users to stream gameplay to and from any computer on the same in-home network since early 2014. Last year, Valve released the \$50, streaming-focused Steam Link to help PC players stream games to the living room TV; we found that hardware a bit wanting in the quality department.

PS4 system update version 3.5 also lets users go "incognito" to appear offline when they are playing and adds social features making it easier to gather friends together in an online party.



# Tenth annual Cisco VNI forecasts 15-fold rise in mobile data traffic

**KUWAIT:** Since 2000, when the first camera phone was introduced, the number of mobile users has quintupled. By 2020, there will be 5.5 billion mobile users, representing 70 percent of the global population1, according to the Cisco Visual Networking Index (VNI) Global Mobile Data Traffic Forecast (2015 to 2020). The adoption of mobile devices, increased mobile coverage, and demand for mobile content are driving user growth two times faster than the global population over the next five years. This surge of mobile users, smart devices, mobile video and 4G networks will increase mobile data traffic eight-fold over the next five

Smart mobile devices and connections2 are projected to represent 72 percent of total mobile devices and connections by 2020-up from 36 percent in 2015. # MODEL AIMS TO TELL RESEARCHERS HOW INFECTION PASSES PLACENTA

ed a cellular model of the human placenta to help uncover how infections, from toxoplasmosis to the Zika virus, may pass from a mother to her unborn child. The placenta nourishes a growing fetus, among other critical roles, and yet it's one of the body's least understood organs. One of its jobs is to act as a protective barrier, but sometimes pathogens sneak past. Infections such as rubella, toxoplasmosis, syphilis and HIV are well known for harming fetuses; now the Zika virus rapidly spreading through Latin America is a strong suspect, too.

But "we still don't understand how any of those pathogens actually reach the fetus," or why that happens in one pregnancy but not another, said University of Pittsburgh virologist senior researcher Dr Carolyn Coyne, a virologist at the University of Pittsburgh. Now Coyne's team has developed a way


ary, the barrier that forms in very early pregnancy.

Earlier attempts testing placental cells in lab dishes haven't mimicked that boundary well enough to be of much use, Coyne explained. Her team succeeded in growing the cells into a 3-D structure that's more like the real thing, the researchers reported Friday in the journal Science Advances. The trick was to grow them in a microgravity bioreactor developed by NASA, spinning the cells to mimic the forces of blood flow they'd normally experience in a mother's body, Coyne explained.

Why not just test placentas that are expelled after childbirth? The placenta is quite different in the early weeks of pregnancy - when risks to just-forming fetal organs are thought to be especially high - than months later, said Dr

**WASHINGTON:** Researchers have created a cellular model of the human placendary model of the placenta's outer boundary. Catherine Spong of the National Institutes of Health, which helped fund the work. "What you can learn from a placenta at the end of pregnancy may not tell you what is happening at the beginning of pregnancy," said Spong, of NIH's National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. The new research "has developed a neat model system to help us better understand how the placenta develops and how it might react" to a range of harmful substances.

In the first tests, the model resisted infection by a test virus and by three different strains of a parasite that causes toxoplasmosis, an infection that can trigger miscarriage or birth defects. Next up is testing how it reacts to the Zika virus. The idea: If the model appears to protect like a healthy placenta, then researchers could manipulate it to see what it takes for various pathogens to break through. — AP

# CHINESE SMOG HAS SILVER LINING FOR MASK MAKERS

# 'People's awareness of pollution protection is increasing

**DONGLIU, China:** The steel plants and cement factories scattered across China's Shandong province have made it one of the most contaminated areas of the world's biggest polluter. But for one company, that just makes the business climate better. ASL Masks says it turned out more than 100,000 face coverings last year and aims to more than double that in 2016 as China struggles to shake off the toxic smog produced by its heavy industries. At ASL's Dongliu facility, shabby buildings bearing faded signs from the 1980s exhorting "scientific innovation" are just visible through the haze-pollution levels were six times international standards when AFP visited.

Dozens of middle-aged women wearing bright blue hats and aprons worked in near silence, sliding air filters into holes in the plastic products before threading on straps and yellow buckles. "Smog is bad for the lungs. We all wear masks around here," said packager Chen Aimei. China is the world's top greenhouse gas emitter and last year air quality in some 300 haze-hit Chinese cities failed to meet national standards. Levels of PM2.5, tiny particles which can embed deep within the lungs, are usually above the World Health Organization's recommended maximum of 25 parts per million. In the northeastern city of Shenyang they reached more than 1,400 in November.

The pollution-mostly generated by burning coal to power industry and heat homes, along with road traffic-is responsible for hundreds of thousands of premature deaths in China each year, experts say. Public anger is mounting over the

# **Animal manure**

Even when many Chinese factory workers had downed tools for the Lunar New Year holiday in February, CEO Zhang Wenchao kept his staff on until the last possible moment. "December to April is our busiest period... because it's the peak for pollution," he said. ASL started making industrial masks in the 1980s, but has since turned to the more lucrative anti-pollution equipment market. Demand has grown as authorities have started releasing more data on the problem, and state media estimate the Chinese pollution mask market was worth nearly 4 billion yuan (\$600 million) in 2015.

ASL has designed a product specially adapted for youngsters by measuring the faces of 100 children. "People's awareness of pollution protection is increasing all the time. People know that PM 2.5 is bad for them," Zhang said. Shandong, in eastern China, is the center of the industry, with another production hub, Dadian, dubbed the "mask village" for producing the cheapest specimens. It can be a murky business. Dadian was hit by scandal last year when local media reported second-hand fabric used to make the masks was piled up beside fresh manure, and slept in by stray dogs. Customs officers in China's commercial capital Shanghai said in December they had seized 120,000 fake respiratory masks, labelled as being made by US manufacturer 3M Co. In other cases, hospital masks have been washed and resold as new, reports

'Like doctors'

declared a "war on pollution" at the Communist-controlled National People's Congress (NPC) parliament two years ago. But although average particulate levels in Chinese cities fell 10.3 percent in 2015, according to official figures collated by Greenpeace, none met the WHO's standards. On Friday, a day before Li opened this year's NPC session, PM2.5 counts were well over 300 in the capital.

Beijing and other cities in China issued their first ever "red alerts" for pollution this winter, banning half of all private cars from roads and advising some schools to close. The alerts struck fear into millions-and were a boon to companies selling protection from the smog. "In the red alert, suddenly all these people who never cared were like: 'Oh my God!" said Liam Bates, the founder of a company producing handheld pollution monitors, mainly for the Chinese market.

"In 24 hours we sold pretty much what we sold the entire month before," he added. Zhang, 29, whose father bought ASL when it was an unprofitable state-owned enterprise in the 1990s, said he had amassed considerable wealth, but declined to go into detail. Behind a large mahogany desk, he brandished his latest invention-an air filter which covers only the nose-and insisted he hoped efforts to reduce pollution would be effective, even at the expense of sales. "We are like doctors looking at patients," he said. "No doctor wants his patient to be sick." Still, Zhang does not expect demand to die. "Over the next decade, there will be efforts to improve the air quality," he said. "But it won't be completely

# **NEW PIONEERING TREATMENT** FOR NASAL ALLERGIES

LONDON: Nasal allergy is one of the most common conditions affecting millions worldwide. It is one of the medical conditions which have so far has no cure. All of the current treatments are symptomatic treatments and for short periods of time, not mentioning the countless side effects from misuse or long use of the medication in a form of tablets, nasal spray, or various injections. The procedure is non-invasive with no incision, no wounds with long term effect. The procedure is done in ten minutes, under local anesthesia in a clinic setting with no admission to the hospital, with no nasal packing or dressing and the patient can go back to his office or home following the procedure.

Most of the nasal allergy (allergic rhinitis) symptoms are an immune triggered inflammation of nasal tissues and mucosal linings of the nose and para- nasal sinuses, the nasal allergy process which occurred as a result of an inhaled, administrated or ingested materials or allergens. The most common and famous allergens are pollens, dust and house dust mite (a microscopic parasite usually on the lining of bed or pillow cases) or certain ingested food. Allergic Rhinitis is one of the most common untreatable medical conditions since it was recognized as a medical condition with worldwide distribution. It can also cause many symptoms of suffering to the patients with various degrees of long or short term complications i.e. sinusitis, polyposis, loss sense of smell, excessive watery, mucous or even muco-purulent secretions, unpleasant smell in the nose or mouth, mucous, loss sense of taste, headaches, migraine, snoring, blocked ears, reduced hearing, triggering unbalance and light headed attacks when affecting the ears, disturb breathing at night and other complications and most importantly it does affect the quality and enjoyment of life and can also cause social embarrassment.

# Symptoms of nasal allergy


Most of the symptoms and signs are mainly affecting the inside of the nose and nasal breathing, but it can also affect the face eyes and throat. It can also cause general malaise, fatigue, stress and affecting the quality of life.. The main symptoms are nasal blockage, rhinorrea(nasal secretions), itching, sneezing, watery post nasal dripping, facial pain, headaches, headaches, facial congestion, partial anosmia(loss sense of smell) or rarely total anosmia, dark shadow or rings below and around the eyes, occasional swelling of the nose, sometimes around the eyes, watering or thick nasal mucopurulent secretion, loss a reduced sense of smell, blocked ears ( due to the blockage of Eustachian tube openings) which can cause reduced hearing and other symptoms that may exacerbate or trigger the attacks of migraine, tension headache, asthma, recurrent chest infection etc.

The irritating itching does not only involve the nose or para-nasal sinuses but it can also involve the mouth, pharynx, face, eyes and the throat. Most patients suffer a combination of these symptoms and signs, but in some patients, may only have one or two symptoms of nasal allergy.

# Types of nasal allergy

Allergic Rhinitis could be seasonal, perennial (all year round), an instant allergy from certain materials, or senile allergies. Allergy of the Nose and para- nasal sinuses becomes one of the most common medical conditions especially in modern history. The condition is wide spread all over the world and it affects all ages. The condition became worse with the advancement of civilization and pollutions. Nasal allergy even becomes reluctant to the effect of symptomatic treatment of the medication and ends with a poor response to medications such as nasal spray, anti-allergy tablets or injections. It has created a situation when poor responses to the current treatment has lead to more misuses of medication when frequent, higher doses and multiple medications are administered to the nose which puts the patient in a vicious circle that includes negative counter effects to the nose and general health.

The rebound phenomenon start affecting nasal tissues and the mucosa or linings of nasal and par nasal sinuses which start a defense mechanism; that being a poor response to medication, hypertrophied or

thickening of the mucosa and the normal structures in the nose in order to avoid the direct and chemical effect of nasal sprays and other locally applied medications to the nose.

# Complications of nasal allergy:

Nasal allergy usually cause intermittent nasal blockage and in severe and untreated or complicated cases can cause a constant nasal blockage. Nasal allergy can cause a loss of sense of smell, nasal polyps, enlarged or hypertrophy of nasal turbinates (long structures inside the nose), blocked lacrimal duct, acute or chronic purulent rhinitis and sinusitis, blocked ears, recurrent secretary or purulent otitis media, hearing loss unbalance and even vertigo. Triggering or worsening the attacks of asthma, migraine, recurrent headaches sinusitis and others medical conditions.

# Diagnosis of nasal allergy

The full medical history of the condition with signs and symptoms of nasal allergy are the major factors to reach for a diagnosis. ENT Examination of the nose, mouth, pharynx, ears and neck. The special coloration of the nasal mucosal linings and the type of nasal secretions is highly indicative of nasal allergy. Other signs, like hypertrophied or enlarged inferior or middle turbinate with excessive watery secretions, mucous or even mucopurulent secretions( especially in children). Detailed examination by flexible or rigid fiberoptic nasoendoscopy which allows for full assessment of the nasal cavities, signs of complications, examining the middle meatal area where the ostiums(openings) of some sinuses can be seen and to make sure there is no infection or polyps or mass or foreign body are inside the nose of sinuses.

# **Investigations for nasal allergy**

The investigation for nasal allergy like radiological test to exclude or confirm any complication inside the nose or para-nasal sinuses, an allergy test in order to discover the allergen which triggers the nasal allergy which in most of the times accompanies with allergy of the mouth, pharynx, ears, lungs, eyes and sometimes the skin. The cause for allergic rhinitis is a single allergen or allergens, and can be either inhaled through the nose or mouth, or ingested, or might has been in contact with mucosa of the nose(medicine or any other materials). It is not possible to do the test for all or every allergen, the test are not 100% confirmatory and may provide a false positive results. The allergy tests are not requested in every case, but it needs to be done in severe, reluctant, resistant cases, when there is no repose to medication and when the potential allergen is affecting general health.

In the modern world cost effectiveness is an issue to many hospitals or medical centers and practically speaking it is not possible to test every one with nasal allergy, not mentioning the huge financial burden arising from the cost, personnel involved and the time required for conductions of the test.

The test done to find out the cause for allergy is usually performed to search for the suspected allergen causing the nasal allergy. Once the allergen is found, the first treatment is avoidance of the substance or substances (in practice is usually very difficult for inhaled allergens). By complete avoidance of the allergen (which is almost impossible) the allergy symptoms will be dramatically reduced but rarely will it completely stop the allergy.

X-ray of the nose and sinuses. This type of investigation is much less informative than the CT scan, x-ray is usually requested for children with nasal allergy or as a survey test for the presence of any complications, sinusitis or adenoid hypertrophy.

# ELECTRIC SUPERCAR WINS YOUNG CROATIAN GLOBAL FAME

SVETA NEDELJA, Croatia: He's the name behind the world's first electric supercar, winning international plaudits for his ingenuity. But for Croatia's 28-year-old Mate Rimac, it all started as a hobby in his garage. A keen techie since high school, Rimac was racing an old BMW when he blew the engine and decided to turn the car into an electric one starting with pieces he bought on the Internet. A decade later, his firm Rimac Automobili is becoming a global leader in electric vehicle technology, selling Concept One supercars for 850,000 euros (\$923,000) each and giving a much-needed boost to Croatia's start-up scene.

"We want to be the best in the world in what we do and we are changing the world," Rimac told AFP in his factory showroom in the small town of Sveta Nedelja, near the Croatian capital. The confident but modest entrepreneur was named by Politico Europe in December as one of 28 people across the continent who are "shaping, shaking and stirring Europe". But mastering the complex technology of electric sports cars and winning financing was no easy task-especially in a small country of 4.3 million people with no automotive industry.

Rimac formed the company in 2009 when he realized there was not much left of the original vehicle he had transformed in his garage, and the aim was to build an electric supercar from scratch. "First we had to create a team, then the know-how by trial-and-error method to eventually become a company that could make a product," he said.

### **Motor show success**

The company unveiled the Concept One at the 2011 Frankfurt Motor Show, where nobody expected a small Croatian firm to showcase an electric car that could reach 100 kilometers (62 miles) per hour in a staggering 2.8 seconds. Last week at the Geneva International Motor Show, Rimac introduced the production version of the car along with a prototype of its "evil twin", the even more powerful

"We can't really decide which Rimac creation we'd rather have, so we're off to get lottery tickets with hopes of buying both," said a review on motoring news site Autoblog. Many expected Rimac's success would lead him to move somewhere else, such as Silicon Valley, Germany or Italy. But instead he has kept the business in Croatia, a country slowly emerging from six years of recession. "I want to do it here... I'm stubborn," he said. "I think it is possible, I

mean we are doing very well."

He plans to build another factory in Sveta Nedelja, while his employee numbers are set to double this year to 300. Their average age is 30, and many are young engineers straight out of university. They build most of the supercar parts from scratch on-site-from the body and chassis to the power distribution unit and batteries-sticking to Rimac's philosophy of creating know-how and jobs instead of outsourcing. "That's why we are growing so quickly and becoming experts in different fields," said Rimac, who won financing from three international investors in 2014 and is now in a second round of

Two Concept One prototypes, including the red vehicle unveiled in Frankfurt, were on display behind Rimac as he spoke to AFP, while nearby engineers worked on three cars to be delivered to the United States, Germany and Italy within a month. The firm is producing a limited quantity of

just eight Concept One vehicles for clients who are both motor fanatics and technology afficionadosand can afford the hefty price tag.

### 'World going electric'

The supercar may be Rimac's headline product, but he says it is only a showcase for the company's technology, from infotainment systems to battery packs, which aim to reach a far wider audience-in ordinary cars, planes, ships, bicycles and wheelchairs. "We are helping the world to go electric. Our business is to implement these technologies and help other industries to go electric," he said. Spin-off firm Greyp Bikes, set up in 2013, produces high-per-

formance electric bicycles that can reach up to 70 kilometres per hour. So far around 80 have been sold around the world for 8,500 euros each.

Rimac said the company was not directly affected by Croatia's problematic business environment, which sees companies burdened by excessive red tape and changeable fiscal rules. But he stressed that a better framework was needed to help the country's young entrepreneurs, who only succeeded "either by themselves or despite everything". "We are creating our own little island here with positive young people... We are trying to be one of the sparks in Croatia that will trigger the change that is  ${\sf necessary,"} \ {\sf he said.} \ {\sf ---} \ {\sf AFP}$

# EXPERTS OFFER ABDULLAH AL-SHUKRY A SECOND CHANCE AT LIFE

**LONDON:** For Abdullaziz Al-Shukry, Great tors said that it was due to a lack of oxygen. Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH) is more than a hospital. It is the place that offered his son, Abdullah, a second chance at life. "There are no words to explain how I feel and how much I appreciate everything. This is my hospital, I feel at home here. I love this hospital" Abdullah says in fond memory of GOSH. For Abdullaziz and his wife who now care for Abdullah full-time, GOSH offered them an num cofactor which leads to an accumulation answer to what was wrong with their son, something that had escaped doctors back in Kuwait, and the chance for them to care and support him. 'Until I came to Great Ormond Street Hospital, I was so worried. We didn't know what was wrong with Abdullah," Abdullaziz explains. "Now finally, finally after everything he's been through, he's smiling, he's happy."

The mystery began when Abdullah was born. He began vomiting and would not breast feed and was transferred almost immediately to an ICU in Kuwait and stayed there for four months before being moved to GOSH. "They could not tell us what was wrong in Kuwait and we were so worried - we wanted to make sure our son had the best treatment," Abdullaziz states. "One of the doc-

Another said it was liquids on the brain and he would get better while one doctor said he would not live another 6 months." Once at GOSH Abdullah was seen by Dr Sophia Varadkar, an expert neurologist, who diagnosed Abdullah with a rare condition known as molybdenum cofactor deficiency. The condition is caused by the absence of molybdeof toxic levels of sulphite and neurological damage. Abdullaziz remarks how grateful the family was to know what was wrong so that they could begin to care for him properly: "Previously I was worried about him, now we know what is wrong, I am happier. We were lucky to have amazing doctors treating our son. They treated him like their own child they took amazing care of him."

# **Chest pain**

Abdullah also presented with a series of complications including a hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, which is a condition where the heart muscle overgrows and causes problems in the outflow of blood from the left sided pumping chamber. Abdullah was referred to the expert care of Dr Alessandro Giardini, a paediatric cardiologist at GOSH specialising in the care of children with congenital heart disease and hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. "Abdullah had hypertrophic cardiomyopathy which was causing his heart muscle to bugle, causing a narrowing on the way out of the left side of the heart. The condition meant he was very vulnerable to even small infections. If he had caught an infection it would have put his heart under a great strain that could have potentially caused him to suddenly die." Dr Giardini explains, "This condition is very common in adults and although rarer in children it is not unheard of. We need to raise the awareness of this condition for the public, as it can result in sudden death. It causes chest pain, shortness of breath, palpitations and sometimes sudden death, but it can be treated and managed."

"I had been managing Abdullah's hypertrophic cardiomyopathy with medications for a number of years," Dr Giardini explains, "Unfortunately, the situation evolved to the point where the medications were not sufficient anymore." Dr Giardini was able to offer Abdullah an operation called a myectomy whereby some of the excess muscle of the heart is carved out and removed to allow



space for the blood to come out of the left side of the heart. "As expected," Dr Giardini says, "Abdullah's recovery was long, but he has made very good progress and is much better than before the operation."

Abdullaziz explains his gratitude for the care his son received from Dr Giardini, "without him I wouldn't be happy, and my son wouldn't be alive. He did everything possible to help my son and without him, my son

wouldn't be smiling today." Whilst Abdullah will still have complications associated with molybdenum cofactor deficiency, he has recovered well from the operation. "He is still in the ICU but we are solving the problems now." Abdullaziz says. The future for Abdullah looks positive, with a loving family dedicated to providing full-time care for him, he is achieving things that his family weren't sure were possible when he was first diagnosed.

The lounge is open to British Airways' First and Club World (business class) customers as well as Silver and Gold Executive Club members. Earlier this week, British Airways was announced as the top Consumer Superbrand for the third year in a row in the prestigious Superbrands UK awards, beating off competition from 1,600 rivals to take the top spot. The airline also won the Business Superbrand title for a second year in a row. This is the first time any company has ever won the double consequently.

# **Austrian conductor Nikolaus Harnoncourt dies at 86**

elebrated Austrian conductor Nikolaus Harnoncourt, considered to be the "pope" of the Baroque music revival, died Saturday aged 86, three months after announcing his retirement, his family announced. "Nikolaus Harnoncourt took his last breath peacefully surrounded by family," said the short announcement carried by the Austrian news agency APA. In December Harnoncourt had announced his retirement, citing health reasons, in a farewell letter to the audience of the Wiener Musikverein, home to the Vienna Philharmonic orchestra.

"My physical capacities mean that I have to cancel all my upcoming projects," he wrote in an open letter to disappointed fans with tickets to a concert by the baroque ensemble he founded, the Concentus Musicus Wien, the weekend of his 86th birthday at the start of December. "An era is over," the Musikverein's director Thomas Angyan told APA. "I didn't think so little time would pass between his retirement and his death. We must continue with the musical heritage which he left us." Count Nikolaus de la Fontaine und d'Harnoncourt-Unverzagt was born in Berlin on December 6, 1929 to a granddaughter of a Habsburg Archduke and an Austrian count.

Growing up in Graz, southern Austria, he was already a contrarian thinker. "Even when I was small, I always took the opposite point of view. I'm not someone who agrees," he said, suggesting that his rebellious intellect stemmed from being called up just two weeks before World War II ended. Harnoncourt showed a keen interest in the arts early on, and studied the cello at Vienna's Academy of Music, joining the Vienna Symphony Orchestra as cellist in

But the authoritarianism of conductors enraged him."I used to ask them the 'why' behind their instructions. But the only reply I ever got was 'Because I say so," Harnoncourt complains. "Even the best musicians simply had to play. They were all part of an instrument called an 'orchestra', and the conductor was its player." His intensive research into historical instruments and period performance practice led him to set up his own ensemble, Concentus Musicus, in 1953 and it began giving concerts in 1957.

# **Classical music**

Organized by the musicians themselves, with help from their wives and partners, they specialized in renaissance, baroque and early classical music by the likes of Bach, Beethoven or Haydn. In 1969, Harnoncourt quit the Vienna Symphony and the decision-and the ensuing financial and professional insecurity that entailed (he and his wife had had four children by then) — was one of the best he ever took, he says. In musically conservative Vienna, his insistent questioning raised hackles as it ran contrary to the norms of the established classical music scene.—AFP

# **Susan Sarandon** takes in Colombian sights, filmfest

scar-winning actress and producer Susan Sarandon has touched down in Cartagena, the historic resort city on Colombia's Caribbean coast for its celebrated annual film festival. "Morning Cartagena!" she said on Twitter from the city which has a large Spanish-colonial era old city, a massive fort and glittering highrises along the beach.

On Friday, Sarandon, 69, was honored with a showing of her film "Dead Man Walking" for which she won an Academy Award for best actress in 1996. As a quest of the Cartagena de Indias International Film Festival, now in its 56th year, Sarandon also gave a seminar at Latin America's oldest film festival, a showcase for the region's works in progress.—AFP

oland marked the 90th birthday of the country's eading filmmaker, Andrzej Wajda, with special showings of his films and exhibitions honoring his life. Wajda, whose movies focus on key moments in Poland's history, is still active.

He is currently working on a movie about Polish avantgarde painter Wladyslaw Strzeminski, whose works were banned by the communist regime. Wajda's last movie was "Man of Hope," which told the story of Lech Walesa, who founded the Solidarity freedom movement. "Man of Iron," focusing on the rise of Solidarity out of worker protests, won the 1981 Palme d'Or at Cannes. In 2000, he received an Academy Award for lifetime achievement.—AP

# Joseph Gordon-Levitt drops out of 'The Sandman'

oseph Gordon-Levitt has ditched his "Sandman" project at New Line due to disagreement with the studio. The announcement came a day after New Line confirmed that "The Conjuring 2" writer Eric Heisserer had come on board. "The Sandman" had been set up at Warner Bros. in 2013 with Gordon-Levitt coming aboard to produce with "The Dark Knight" screenwriter David Goyer for an adaptation of the DC Comics title. Gordon-Levitt said Saturday that the disagrements emerged after Warner subsidiary New Line took over the project.

He posted the statement on his Facebook page Saturday: "So, as you might know if you like to follow these sorts of things, a while back, David Goyer and I made a producing deal with Warner Brothers to develop a movie adaptation of Neil Gaiman's SANDMAN," Gordon-Levitt wrote. "Neil himself came on as an executive producer, we hired the excellent screenwriter, Jack Thorne, and we started in on the ambitious task of adapting one of the most beloved and boundary-pushing titles in the world of comics. I was pleased with the progress we were making, even though we still had quite a ways to go.

"Recently, as you also might know if you like to follow

these sorts of things, the sorta 'ownership' (for lack of a better term) of the Sandman material changed hands when Warner Brothers shifted the entire catalogue of Vertigo comics (an imprint of DC) to their subsidiary, New Line. And a few months ago, I came to realize that the folks at New Line and I just don't see eye to eye on what makes Sandman special, and what a film adaptation could/should be. So unfortunately, I decided to remove myself from the project. I wish nothing but the best for the team moving forward.

"I'd like to thank all the great people I've had the opportunity to work with on this one. I've had a blast with and learned a ton from David and Jack. Niija Kuykendall, Greg Silverman, and everyone at Warner Brothers have been fantastic, as have Geoff Johns and everyone at DC. And it's been a particular privilege as well as a rocking good time getting to know Mr. Gaiman, whose generous insights and masterful work have certainly convinced me that the Lord of Dreams and the Prince of Stories are one and the same Endless pattern."—Reuters

For once, the overriding sensuality of the 56 looks wasn't achieved by exposing inches of flesh, as is often the case with the popular 51-year-old designer.

In this more subtle show, it was the suggestion of flesh, made faintly visible by sections of sheer tulle and lace, which



gave the gowns their power. The darker palette - lots of black, deep red and ultramarine - gave this collection a more sophisticated feel. But occasional flashes of Seventies boho prints, like one red tiedye style silk gown modeled by Kendall Jenner, also ensured the collection had a little fun.

# **Vivienne Westwood is renamed**

British fashion designer Vivienne Westwood has renamed her Gold Label brand, which she presents each womenswear season in Paris, after her husband and house creative director, Andreas Kronthaler. Kronthaler, a 63year-old former fashion student of Westwood, whom she then married, has

long worked on the fashion designs. But the name change "Andreas Kronthaler for Vivienne Westwood," the house says, will signal a "new direction." The changes came in a plan to streamline the British house, a direction popular among established London-based houses recently, such as Burberry and Paul Smith.

This season's installment of Kronthaler for Vivienne Westwood delved into the styles of the East. It might have been a new geographical direction for the house, but the eclectic fashion fusion remained the same. But when Japanese-style platform shoes were unearthed it became abundantly clear that this collection's Asian musing wouldn't be confined to India,

At times the silhouette - circular collar, stiff bodice and short slim skirt - channeled a sort of Roman centurion. It was a woman dressed as if ready for battle. The saleable collection mellowed as it progressed to produce its best look: a slinky cream and burnt orange satin gown, with a flash of a sporty stripe. —AP



# show touts US parks, bringing great outdoors inside

he City of Brotherly Love wouldn't normally be considered rustic, but starting Saturday it will be home to Big Timber Lodge - a structure welcoming people to the Philadelphia Flower Show. This year, the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society has brought the great outdoors inside to mark the National Park Service's 100th anniversary. Huge, verdant installations and floral designs encourage visitors to "Explore America" by paying homage to natural treasures like Acadia, Yosemite and Redwood.

"The flower show this year covers every kind of landscape, from the wilds of Yellowstone's forest down to urban balconies and even windowsills," said Matt Rader, president of the horticultural society. The nine-day festival runs through March 13. Billed as the largest event of its kind in the US, the show attracted about 250,000 people last year. Visitors enter the 10-acre main hall through Big Timber Lodge, where they encounter bison and bear sculptures and a 12-foot-tall waterfall surrounded by evergreens, hyacinths, crocuses, cosmos and other woodland flowers. Two giant overhead screens show videos of various parks.

An exhibit honoring Independence National Historical Park features a giant, flowered Liberty Bell suspended over the grassy "People's Promenade." A tribute to Ansel Adams' iconic photos of Yosemite uses clusters of white orchids hanging from strings to mimic the white foam of Vernal Fall. The flower show partnership continues the park service's yearlong centennial celebration and public engagement campaign. Officials are looking to spark broad interest and support for the parks, which face a nearly \$12 billion maintenance backlog nation-

BJ Dunn, deputy superintendent for Independence park, said discussions with the horticultural society began two years ago. "We were talking about how complementary our missions are," Dunn said. "It just seemed to be a natural fit." Throughout the week, rangers will staff the park service's pavilion and broadcast live interviews from sites across the country - including from Denali National Park in Alaska, where employees will introduce their sled dog team to the flower show audience.



For his exhibit, Jack Blandy of Stoney Bank Nurseries in Glen Mills, Pennsylvania, recreated a scene after a 1988 fire in Yellowstone, "which everybody thought was a devastating event." "But in reality, it was actually a great benefit to Yellowstone because it was all part of the renewal of nature," he said. The park's lodge pole pines, he noted, only reproduce when fire germinates their pine cones. So Blandy's display juxtaposes barren tree trunks with flowers like lupines and rudbeckia, along with representations of Yellowstone's famous hot springs and geysers - a burbling mud pit and colorful, steaming replica of Morning Glory Pool.

Other flower show highlights include plant judging, a butterfly garden, interactive exhibits and craft workshops. Also new this year is a "Railway Garden," where model trains rumble through miniaturized National Parks landscapes. The annual event, which dates to 1829, serves as a rite of spring in the region. Proceeds benefit the Pennsylvania Horticultural Society and its programs, including an urban tree planting campaign and City Harvest, which provides locally grown, fresh produce for underserved families.—AP
