SAVE THESE CHILDREN

read an article a few days ago written by Reem Al-Lougayan. She touched on a key topic, and I share her concern. Reem wrote about the phenomenon of fake beggars plaguing the streets of Kuwait. She said that a few men show up at traffic lights in cleaners' uniforms with brooms and dustpans pretending to be street sweepers. But in fact they are begging. The funny thing is that these 'cleaners' are showing up at night!

I would like to add to the worries. There are dozens of young children begging at traffic lights, in front of co-ops and everywhere in Kuwait. If you drive down Damascus Street, which is my route to the paper, the same boy can be found standing there selling cheap toys like Star Wars light sabers and pet fish. He has been there for years. I remember him as a small kid, but now he's a grown young man and he's still begging at this traffic light. The scorching heat of the sun or the hail and thunder of the winter doesn't stop him. He must have a partnei because he works the morning shift and later in the night, I find another boy there - as if they are doctors in a hospital working in shifts. May I know where is the Ministry of Interior? I'm sure we have enough police and enough patrol cars to catch beggars. My friend tells me she sees the same thing in Salwa. Just down the police station in front of the school by the co-op, a young boy not more than 10 years old sits almost daily "selling" watermelon. Why isn't he in school? This is what's worrying us. It's not whether they beg or not. We are not against beggars. Don't misunderstand me. I have a soft heart. But why aren't these beggar children in school? And I have a feeling that it's organized and someone is using and abusing them. Because sometimes I see a car or a truck with an adult man dropping off these children and later collecting them back. So what is this? It's a gang, effectively. These boys may be innocent, but they are victims. I also worry for their safety and welfare as they stand at the traffic light until late in the night. What if someone tries to snatch these boys and abduct them for whatever purposes? They are too young to be responsible and left out in the street. I hope the interior ministry takes this issue up seriously and helps these children find someplace safe.

KUWAIT: The court of cassation, the top court in the country whose rulings are final, yesterday rejected an appeal by prominent bedoon (stateless) activist Abdulhakeem Al-Fadhli and five others and upheld a one-year jail term against them to be followed with deportation. Fadhli and others, including his younger brother Ahmad, were convicted of taking part in illegal protests, defying orders and assaulting police.

He and the other five activists were arrested during a peaceful gathering by bedoons over two years ago to demand the right to Kuwaiti citizenship and other human rights. The lower court sentenced them to one year in jail, and the sentence was confirmed by the appeals court. Police arrested Fadhli last month and he

has since been in jail awaiting the cassation court's ruling. There are an estimated 110,000 bedoons in Kuwait who claim they or their forefathers had been illegally denied their natural right to Kuwaiti citizenship. The government says many of them do not qualify for citi-zenship after they or their ancestors destroyed their original identification documents to seek Kuwaiti citizenship and the many benefits associated with it. Although the court ordered their deportation after the jail term, bedoons cannot be deported because they do not hold any nationality and thus other countries do not take them.

Meanwhile, the African island nation of the Comoros has said it is ready to consider taking Kuwait's bedoons, newspapers reported yesterday. "If the issue is raised officially, we are ready to discuss it," visiting Comorian **Continued on Page 13**

Dubai airport transit point for drugs traffic

ROME: Dubai airport has become a transit point for smugglers bringing high-value narcotics into Europe, the Italian police said yesterday. Two smugglers have been arrested in recent days at Rome's Fiumicino airport after arriving via Dubai, they said. One was an 19-year-old Slovak with two kilos of cocaine stashed in a false bottom of his suitcase who had departed from Rio de Janeiro, while the other was a Nigerian who hid vials of cocaine in his socks. The street value of the two seizures was put at around half a million dollars. The smugglers do not leave Dubai's transit lounge, as this would expose them to customs checks. Instead, they use the Dubai-Europe leg and the tough anti-drug reputation of the UAE to mask the country where they began their trip.

Yemen bans qat on weekdays in Aden

ADEN: Authorities in south Yemen have banned the sale of the mild narcotic gat on working days, and it will be only allowed into the city of Aden on weekends, witnesses said yesterday. Checkpoints have been set up around Aden to stop qat shipments from entering the port city, as patrols roamed markets to enforce the ban on sales, the witnesses said. Security forces said in a statement that they had decided to "ban the sale of gat in Aden and its suburbs during the week". The statement said the ban was prompted by complaints from citizens and due to "security, social and health" concerns, adding that qat markets caused traffic jams.

LONDON: Donald Trump warned yesterday he may end up having a bad relationship with British Prime Minister David Cameron, who branded the presumptive Republican presidential nominee's proposal to stop Muslim immigration to the US "stupid". "It looks like we are not going to have a very good relationship," Trump told Britain's ITV television. "Who knows, I hope to have a good relationship with him but he's not willing to address the problem either."

In December, Trump called for a "total and complete shutdown of Muslims entering the United States until our country's representatives can figure out what is going on", citing "great hatred towards Americans by large segments of the Muslim population". Cameron branded the tycoon's stance as "divisive, stupid and wrong" and has refused to retract his comments, though he said on May 5 that anyone who comes through the US presidential primaries deserves "respect".

Cameron's spokesman told reporters yesterday: "The PM has made his views on Donald Trump's comments very clear: he disagrees with them." But he added: "He's been clear that he will work with whoever is president of the United States." Trump insisted he was "not stupid... just the opposite", and denied he was divisive, calling himself"a unifier".

He told ITV his campaign trail policies were just "suggestions", but said there was a "tremendous" problem with Islamic extremism. The tycoon rejected claims he was anti-Muslim. "Absolutely not. I am anti-terror," he said. Trump said he had "many Muslim friends", one of whom told him: "Donald you have done us such a favor: you have brought out a problem that nobody

wants to talk about?" Trump also blasted the new London Mayor Sadig Khan, the first Muslim elected to run a Western capital city. Khan, who took office on May 9, has branded Trump "ignorant" on Islam and claimed

the tycoon was making the world more dangerous by alienating mainstream Muslims. Trump said he was offended by Khan's denouncement. "I think they were very rude statements and, frankly, tell him I will remember those statements. They are very nasty statements," Trump said. "When he won I wished him well. Now, I don't care about him. Let's see how he does, let's see if he's a good mayor." A spokesman for Khan yesterday again described Trump's views as "ignorant, divisive and dangerous". "It's the politics of fear at its worst and will be rejected at the ballot box," the spokesman said. — AFP

BUFFETT TAKES \$1BN BITE OF APPLE STOCK

NEW YORK: Billionaire investor Warren Buffett has taken a \$1 billion stake in Apple, whose stock has been in an extended slump. The stake was revealed in a regulatory filing by Buffett's holding company Berkshire Hathaway after Apple shares skidded last week to their lowest level in two years. The filing did not indicate when Buffett purchased the shares or his reasons, but Buffett is renowned as a "value" investor who takes

positions in firms which trade below what he sees as their fair value.

The filing with the THE Securities and Exchange Commission showed Berkshire with a holding of 9.8 million Apple shares at a value of around \$1.07 billion. Apple has been under pressure as a result of slowing iPhone sales, threatening its chief revenue and profit source. Last Thursday, the dip in Apple briefly boosted

Google parent Alphabet to the number one position among companies based on market value. Buffett's entry comes weeks after

another billionaire, Carl Icahn, announced he had sold all his Apple holdings after an extended campaign to get the company to deliver more value to shareholders. Buffett, who is among the world's richest people, controls through his holding group a number of insurance, retail and media operations. Berkshire recently boosted its stake in IBM while reducing its holdings in Wal-Mart.

Buffett is also willing to back one of the bidders for troubled Internet pioneer Yahoo, CNBC television reported yesterday. The report said Buffett had agreed to work with Quicken Loans founder and chairman Dan Gilbert on a bid for the core assets of Yahoo, which has been evaluating the potential for a sale. Gilbert is also known as the owner of the NBA's Cleveland Cavaliers team. "I'm an enormous admirer of Dan and what

he has accomplished in Quicken Loans," Buffett said in an email to CNBC.

"Yahoo is not the type of thing I'd ever be an equity partner in. I don't know the business and wouldn't know how to evaluate it, but if Dan needed financing, with proper terms and protections, we would be a possible financing help." Yahoo, which has fallen behind rivals such as Google and Facebook, has said it is studying the possibility of a

sale as it pursues its efforts to revive growth, focusing on mobile users.

US telecom giant Verizon is also believed to be among the bidders for Yahoo, which has not commented on details of the bidding process. Yahoo shares rose 2.8 percent to \$37.51 after the news report involving Buffett. Gilbert is among those having signed the "Giving Pledge", an initiative launched by Buffett and Microsoft founder Bill Gates asking wealthy people to donate the majority of their assets to charity. — AFP (See Page 21)

IRAN CRACKS DOWN ON INSTAGRAM MODELING

TEHRAN: Iran has arrested eight people for working in "un-Islamic" online modeling networks, particularly on Instagram, the head of Tehran's cybercrimes court said on state television. The arrests were made under a two-year-old sting operation named "Spider II", targeting among others models who post photos online without the hijab covering the hair that is compulsory for women in public in Iran since its 1979 Islamic revolution.

It identified 170 people running online Instagram pages - 59 photographers and makeup artists, 58 models, 51 fashion salon managers and designers, and two active institutions, according to a statement from the special court. "We found out that about 20 percent of the (Iranian) Instagram feed is run by the modeling circle," Javad Babaei said on state television late Sunday. They have been "making and spreading immoral and un-Islamic culture and promiscuity", he said.

Babaei said it was the judiciary's duty to "confront those who committed these crimes in an organized manner". In addition to the eight arrests, criminal cases have been opened against 21 other people, he said. The sting operation has homed in on a database of over 300 popular Iranian Instagram accounts and connected accounts, Babaei said.



CAIRO: Issues related to Arab and Muslim youth were the focus of a meeting held in Cairo on Sunday between visiting Minister of Information and Minister of State for Youth Affairs Sheikh Salman Sabah Al-Humoud Al-Sabah and Grand Imam of Al-Azhar Sheikh Ahmad Al-Tayyib.

CABINET 'VERY UNHAPPY' OVER FIFA'S **CONTINUED SUSPENSION OF SPORTS**

KUWAIT: The Cabinet was "very unhappy" over FIFA Congress vote that failed to lift a suspension of the nation's football association. The Cabinet requested a full report from the Public Authority for Sports (PAS) on necessary procedures that are required to fix the football situation, State Minister for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammad Al-Adbullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah told the press after the Cabinet's meeting yesterday.

He added that these procedures should ensure eliminating all obstacles, promoting sports and to enabling athletes to practice their sports. FIFA suspended the Kuwait Football Association (KFA) last October after finding the government had interfered in the group's affairs. Last Friday, the FIFA Congress voted to continue the suspension of Kuwait.

The Cabinet also listened to an explanation by Finance Minister Anas Al-Saleh, one that pertains to a report by Moody's Corporation Investor's Service, which placed Kuwait's Aa2 long-term issuer rating on review for downgrade. Moody's will review the rating in twelve months' time, Saleh revealed. The Cabinet said that it is satisfied with Kuwait's placing, adding that it will spare no effort to retain that placing through achieving financial reforms and economic development goals.

Letters

At the onset of the meeting held under chairmanship of Acting Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, the cabinet was apprised of a letter received by His Highness the Amir from Mauritanian President Mohamed Ould Abdel Aziz inviting him to attend the 27th Arab Summit due in Nouakchott next July.

The cabinet was also notified by a letter sent to His Highness the Amir from UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon on ways of supporting the activities of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria.

The ministers then addressed a message sent to His Highness the Amir from Turkish Prime Minister Ahmet inviting him to attend a meeting of the Programme of Action for the Least Developed Countries for the Decade due in Antalya between May 27-29, 2016. The cabinet was also notified of a letter to His Highness the Prime Minister from Portuguese Prime Minister Antonio Costa inviting him to visit Portugal and hailing bilateral relations.

The Cabinet was informed who would make up Kuwait's delegation to accompany His Highness the Amir to attend the World Humanitarian Summit scheduled for May 22-24 in Turkey. The delegation includes First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh

Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, Deputy Prime Minister, Finance Minister and Acting Oil Minister Anas Khaled Al-Saleh, along with a number of Amiri Diwan and Foreign Ministry officials. The Cabinet voiced confidence that the summit would yield further cooperation towards humanitarian causes across the globe. Moreover, the Cabinet welcomed President of Tajikistan Emomali Rahmon's visit to the country, wishing him a pleasant stay in Kuwait.

Yemeni talks

Meanwhile, the Cabinet was also informed of the progress of United Nations (UN) sponsored Yemeni peace talks in Kuwait, as it wished that a swift solution to the conflict would be reached in order to restore peace and stability in Yemen.

In addition, the Cabinet extended its condolences over the passing away of Member of the Parliament Hamad Abdullah Al-Joaan who played a positive role in serving his country through the podium of the parliament. The Cabinet also expressed condolence to the passing away of former General Staff of Kuwait Armed Forces retired Lieutenant General Abdulrahman Al-Othman, who died in the French Capital of Paris. It also discussed topic listed on the National Assembly's agenda. Moreover, it tackled reports on the latest regional and international developments. ---- KUNA

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL MEETING DISCUSSES PARKING SPACES

KUWAIT: Kuwait Municipality Director Ahmed Al-Manfouhi said that responding to a request by Municipal Council member Osama Al-Otaibi, the Municipal Council would get a report about the number of licensed and unlicensed parking spaces adjacent to various towers and shopping malls within two weeks. In this regard, council member Mane Al-Ajmi said that some of the parking spaces in the Capital Governorate were located on state property without any license from the municipality.

Member Fahd Al-Sane said that activating the central food testing labs and building special ones at border exits must be referred to the technical committee and discussed with both the municipality and the Ministry of Health (MoH). Meanwhile, member Hassan Kamal criticized the municipality's response to inquiries made about the mechanism followed on promoting its employees to senior positions, noting that the municipality was not cooperative and tried to avoid answering the questions.

Approvals

The Municipal Council's meeting approved reorganizing Sheikh Salem Al-Nasser's lands in Abu Fatira, launching a hotline to help fight the presence of bachelors in private residential areas, the Foreign Minister's request to allocate two land plots to build a permanent headquarters for GCC and a training center in West Mishref and a request made by the awqaf ministry to build a monument for the autism center in West Mishref. The meeting also discussed a number of other topics including a proposal to build a municipality court, violations in residential areas, a proposal to build a market in Jahra and many others.

Environmental survey

In other news, MP Mohammed Al-Huwailah urged Minister of Communications and Minister of State for Municipal Affairs Essa Al-Kandari and Minister of Public Works and Minister of State for Assembly Affairs Ali Al-Omair to conduct an urgent environmental survey in Dhaher and to take proper measures to handle violations because the area is suffering from waste and sewage. "Citizens' health is very crucial and this matter cannot be delayed or postponed," he stressed, calling for immediate disposal of polluting elements.

Huwailah also called for the immediate removal of the slaughterhouse and the MPW plant to other locations away from residential areas to protect inhabitants from pollution that had been causing the spread of infectious disease-carrying insects. Huwailah added that slaughterhouse wastes were not being properly treated or handled and that they were being dumped in open garbage containers, causing noxious smells and attracting insects. Huwailah added that the Ministry of Public Works (MPW) plant was old and that sewage water was being kept in an open basin for long because the old equipment malfunctions, which results in foul odors and insects.

US RENEWS COMMITMENT TO PROTECTING KUWAIT SECURITY



LIVESTOCK COMPANY **READY FOR RAMADAN** KNET PREPARED FOR CASH WITHDRAWAL DEMAND

KUWAIT: Kuwait Livestock Transport and Trading Company is ready for the upcoming holy month of Ramadan by providing all the needed meat and live sheep supply in addition to minced and frozen meat products, CEO Osama Boodai said. "We have imported over 120,000 Australian sheep for Ramadan and will receive a further 40,000 by the end of this month," Boodai said, adding that KLTT will give a free platter of minced sheep meat with every sheep customers purchase, in addition to providing special meat cuts to be used for making harees at KD 1.25 per kilogram. Boodai also denied alleged violations of animal rights made by some Australian bodies and stressed that KLTT only dealt with official slaughterhouses.

KLTT Chairman Bader Nasser Al-Subaei said the company was currently building a new ship to join its fleet, which will be the world's largest livestock transport vessel with a capacity of 80,000 sheep and 15,000 cows and calves. He added that the ship would cost €71 million. Subaei added that KLTT was currently building the new Capital slaughterhouse and the central livestock market over an area of 94,000 sq m at a total cost of KD 11 million.

Cash withdrawal

Separately, the Shared Electronic Banking Services Company (KNET) CEO Abdullah Al-Ajmi

expected demand on ATM cash withdrawals to increase during the coming period, namely the last week before Ramadan, which would also coincide with the approach of the summer vacation. He added that the company has prepared a special emergency plan for this period if any ATM or POS machine malfunctions at any time. "We have over 600 ATMs in addition to 1,700 others belonging to banks operating in Kuwait, and 47,000 POS machines operating 24/7 at various stores and markets," he explained. Ajmi added that the emergency plan includes increasing ATMs' capacity, filling them with cash more than once a day, dividing Kuwait into sectors according to withdrawal rates and providing company technicians on a 24/7 basis to handle any malfunction.



NEW TRAFFIC PATROLS ON DUTY TODAY

KUWAIT: Interior Ministry Relations and Security Information Department Director General Brigadier Adel Al-Hashash said new traffic patrol cars will become operational today. He said the traffic sector received 220 patrol cars that will start work today, while 220 more will be received on June 1. Hashash said the

change of colors came after a full study by specialists, to enable the public to distinguish between ministry sectors in the field. Hashash said that any new event at the Interior Ministry is preceded by a media campaign by his department to inform citizens and expats about the latest events at the ministry.

KOC BROUGHT DOWN GAS BURNING RATE TO ONE PERCENT LAST YEAR

KUWAIT: Chief Executive Officer of Kuwait Oil Company (KOC) Jamal Ja'afar said Sunday his company was able to reduce the rate of gas burning dramatically from 17 percent in 2005-2006 to just one percent last year.

"This great achievement will serve as a reference point for the company while developing its strategy for 2040," he said during a ceremony to celebrate the 25th anniversary of KOC's strategic partnership with Kuwait University (KU).

The function gathered Minister of Education and Minister of Higher Education Dr Bader Al-Isa, the two former ministers of oil Abulmohsen Al-Mad'aj and Rashid Al-Omeiri, KU Chancellor Dr Hussein Al-Ansari, dean of the College of Engineering and Petroleum Dr Abdullatif Al-Khleifi and Head of the Petroleum Engineering Dept. DISABLED GIRL, MAID DEAD IN FIRE

KUWAIT: A disabled girl and a domestic helper died in a fire reported inside a Saad Al-Abdullah apartment yesterday. A security source said when firemen inspected the first floor apartment after the fire was put out, they found a 31-year-old bedoon girl, in addition to an Indian woman dead inside. The sources added that the rest of the family members were brought out safe. Investigations are underway to determine the cause of the fire. Separately, firemen put out a fire in a Jleeb Al-Shuyoukh house, as Jleeb, Ardiya and backup centers responded. The house was used as a foam warehouse. The fire was put out before reaching nearby a house, which were evacuated as a precaution. No injuries were reported.

Traffic campaigns

The traffic department carried out several surprise campaigns recently, resulting in issuing 48,284 citations and impounding 1,995 vehicles and five motorcycles, while 43 persons were detained for committing grave violations. Ten were deported for driving without a license.

INTERIOR MINISTRY CONVENES MEETING ON SECURITY VISION

KUWAIT: Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Mohammad Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah met senior security officers and field commanders of his ministry on Sunday to discuss the security vision for 2016-2017.

During the meeting, Assistant Undersecretary of the Ministry for the Operations Affairs Major General Jamal Al-Sayegh made a presentation on the missions of the various sectors of the Ministry as prescribed in plan for maintaining the rule of law nationwide.

The minister was briefed on the executive procedures for addressing any emergency relating to security or traffic during the holy month of Ramadan in collaboration with the other state departments and non-government organizations, according to a statement by the Ministry's Security Media Dept.

Sheikh Mohammad voiced satisfaction with the security plans and the level of preparedness of the security personnel who were able to timely arrest the law-violators. He called for ensuring smooth traffic during the fasting month, and for early planning for the parliamentary elections, due to be held in January, 2017, the statement added. — KUNA

NO FAMILY VISIT VISAS FOR **RELATIVES BORN BEFORE 1950**

VISIT VISAS' EXTENSION STOPPED TILL FURTHER NOTICE

KUWAIT: A foreigner living in Kuwait will not be allowed to issue a family visit visa for a parent or sibling born in 1950 or earlier, according to new Interior Ministry directives. The decisions, made by Assistant Undersecretary for Citizenship and Passports Affairs Major General Sheikh Mazen Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah, come to 'fight manipulation' and prevent individuals from using the visit visa in order to bring his sick relatives to receive free treatment in Kuwait, Al-Rai reported yesterday quoting sources. The new condition also helps prevent using visit visas to bring individuals to Kuwait for begging during Ramadan, said the sources who spoke on the condition of anonymity.

Meanwhile, Directors of residency affairs departments in all six governorates received verbal orders to suspend the extension of all types of visit visas until further notice, Al-Qabas reported yesterday quoting a security source familiar with the news. The decision comes as plans to increase visa fees are set to be implemented

the directors have already started to suspend the extensions since Saturday. Under plans proposed by the Interior Ministry to increase residency fees in Kuwait, a visit visa's charge would jump from KD 2 to KD

30 for each month of the visa's duration, while it would only be renewable for a maximum of three months.

The study also stipulates increasing soon, said the sources, adding that fees to issue dependency visas for

spouses and children by 100 percent, becoming KD 200 for the wife and KD 150 for each child instead of the current fare of KD 100 for the wife and children each. The new fees include paying KD 300 for a dependency visas issued by an expat for his parent; a fee that currently stands at KD 200. Meanwhile, a 100 percent increase is also proposed for visa renewal charges, becoming KD 20 instead of KD 10 for all types of visa.

A report last February indicated that the Interior Ministry had referred the study to the National Assembly for approval. It is currently not known when the parliament will debate it, but if it does pass the new tariffs, it would be the first time in Kuwait's history that MPs have approved increasing fees collected from expats to issue visas.

Increasing visa fees is part of the state's plans to diversify sources of income in light of the falling oil prices. This includes increasing the fees collected for residency visa and traffic fines, which have been unchanged for over 40 years, according to sources.

SEARCH FOR MUGGER

Bootlegger arrested

Police arrested an Indian man who was on his way to deliver 100 bottles of homebrewed liquor to another man who sold them. The Indian was sent to the Drug Control General Department (DCGD). Police patrol officers noticed the Indian was nervous when stopped, so his car was searched and the 100 bottles were found. Meanwhile, policemen arrested a wanted citizen after she verbally insulted them and sent her to the Drugs Control General Department.

Gamblers caught

Ahmadi police arrested five Indians gambling in an open yard in Fintas. They had liquor and gambling tools. A security source said Ahmadi patrols noticed a group of people in a suspicious gathering, and when they approached them, they escaped on foot, but were caught. They were arrested and sent to Fintas police station for further legal action.

Girl freed

A security source said a Kuwaiti citizen in Mahboula told police she saw a speeding pickup truck with a girl in the backseat crying for help, so Interior Ministry operations were informed. The entire area was combed and the vehicle was located. The driver was arrested and the girl, a citizen, was freed. It was discovered that the girl and the driver are in a relationship, and that she had ignored his calls for weeks. He abducted her in an attempt to resume their relationship, but he ended up in police custody.

Weapon smuggling failed

A citizen failed in his attempt to smuggle a firearm he hid under the driver's seat upon his arrival at Nuwaiseeb border outlet, and he was sent to the weapons detectives department.

Security breach

In a strange and clear violation at Kuwait International Airport, a Turkish man entered the country without registering his arrival in the computer system nor was his passport stamped. A security source said the Turkish man asked local authorities why his passport was not stamped on his arrival to Kuwait and not documented in the computer. He was worried about any legal responsibility, and wondered whether this was a new procedure. The source considered what happened as a security breach at Kuwait airport by the counter employee.

Brothel busted

Jleeb Al-Shuyoukh police raided an apartment in the area used as a brothel by four men and four women, all Ethiopian, and one of them was found wanted on several cases. — Al-Rai, Al-Anbaa

Four and a half hours work time in Ramadan

KUWAIT: Ramadan's working hours in the public sector will be between 9:30 am and 2:00 pm on weekdays, sources said. This covers 22 state departments, while working hours in other departments would be from 10:00 am to 2:30 pm, said the sources, noting that the Civil Service Commission is expected to make an official announcement regarding Ramadan's timings in the near future. —Al-Qabas

Customs' devices

KUWAIT: The Customs General Department signed a contract with Global company to import devices to detect explosives, drugs and alcoholic drinks worth KD 20 million. The devices will be imported starting from next June, said Adnan Al-Qudhaibi, Assistant Director for Customs Ports Affairs.—Al-Rai

50,000 workers

KUWAIT: The total number of workers at the Clean Fuel Project is expected to reach between 27,000 and 30,000 by the end of October, sources said, adding that the number is expected to reach 50,000 by the first quarter of 2017. There are around 20,000 workers at the project's site now, the sources said, adding that coordination is in place to receive more than 1,000 workers a week. The project, which is slated to end in 2017, is currently 53 percent complete, the sources said. — Al-Rai

'Kuwaitization'

KUWAIT: The oil sector intends to increase the number of Kuwaiti workers in contractors' contracts from 25 to 30 percent. Kuwait Oil Company (KOC) has already exceeded the required percentage of 'Kuwaitization' in contracts, which employ a total of 2,800 Kuwaitis out of around 10,600 workers. — Al-Anbaa

US tax declarations

KUWAIT: The final date to present US tax declarations under the 'FATCA' law is June 15, 2016, said Abdulaziz Al-Anjari, head of the US tax office in Kuwait. He urged US citizens and US Green Card holders to provide their declarations in due time in order to send them to the US' Internal Revenue Service (IRS), he added. —Al-Anbaa

WORLD POWERS READY TO ARM LIBYA Conference seeks to help unity govt fight against IS


VIENNA: World powers said yesterday they supported the lifting of an arms embargo on Libya and were ready to supply weapons to the country's new unity government to help it fight the growing threat posed by the Islamic State group. "The Government of National Accord has voiced its intention to submit appropriate arms embargo exemption requests to the UN Libya Sanctions Committee to procure necessary lethal arms and materiel to counter UN-designated terrorist groups and to combat (IS) throughout the country. We will fully support these efforts," read a statement by US Secretary of State John Kerry and 24 other top diplomats after talks in Vienna.

The conference was co-chaired by Kerry and his Italian counterpart Paolo Gentiloni whose country has faced a major influx of migrants from Libya fleeing violence and poverty. The North African nation was plunged into chaos after the 2011 NATO-backed uprising that toppled and killed longtime dictator Moamer Kadhafi, with rival militias vying to control the oil-rich country. Taking advantage of the mayhem, the Islamic State group has carved itself a bastion after overrunning the Mediterranean coastal city of Sirte - Gaddafi's hometown - last year and transforming it into a training camp for militants.

A unity government was formed in late March after months of negotiation by UN mediators in a bid to end the political chaos that has undermined the fight against IS. But while the Government of National Accord has received backing from key institutions like the central bank and the National Oil Corporation, it still faces resistance from rival administrations in the east and west of Libya.

Springboard for Attacks

In a bid to stabilize the country, the fledgling regime of Prime Minister Fayez Al-Sarraj drew up a list of requests for Western partners to assist its forces with arms, training and intelligence. The demands were presented at the Vienna conference, whose attendees included the UN's special envoy to Libya Martin Kobler and EU foreign policy chief Federica Mogherini. Europe fears the jihadists, who have in recent weeks made new advances, will use Sirte's port and airport as a springboard to launch attacks on the continent.



"We look forward to partnering with the GNA and neighboring countries to tackle the threat posed throughout the Mediterranean and on its land borders by criminal organizations engaged in all forms of smuggling and trafficking, including in human beings," the world powers including Russia and Saudi Arabia said in their statement. "We are ready to respond to the Libyan government's requests for training and equipping the Presidential Guard and vetted forces from throughout Libya."

Libya's leader, who was also present at the Vienna talks, insisted his country needed assistance, not intervention. "We are not asking for foreign boots on the ground, but we are requesting assistance with training, and lifting the arms embargo on Libya," Sarraj wrote in a column published in the British newspaper The Telegraph yesterday.

Race for Sirte

Libya's divisions have once again deepened in recent days, with the GNA and Haftar's forces each announcing their own plans to fight IS and "liberate" Sirte. "This is a mistake. It must be prevented... we can no longer accept this division," said Nicola Latorre, chairman of the defence committee of the Italian senate and an IS expert. Claudia Gazzini, a Libya analyst at the International Crisis Group, has also warned that the race for Sirte is pushing any hope of a political solution further away.

IS is estimated to have around 5,000 fighters in Libya, and it is trying to enlist hundreds more. This month the jihadists launched suicide attacks on key checkpoints in government-held territory along the Mediterranean coast. The move allowed them to build a defensive line along part of the coastal highway that links the east of Libya where Haftar is based with Tripoli in the west. — AFP

RAFSANJANI DAUGHTER MEETS BAHA'IS, SPARKS IRAN CONTROVERSY

TEHRAN: A meeting between ex-president Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani's daughter and female leaders of the Baha'i community, regarded as "heretics" in the Islamic republic, has sparked controversy in Iran. Faezeh Hashemi recently met Fariba Kamalabadi, one of the leaders of the Baha'i community who had been allowed out of prison on a five-day break, according to Iranian media. A photo of the meeting was published on social media in which Faezeh, wearing Islamic veil, is sitting next to Kamalabadi

and other Baha'i women, all without the hijab. Kamalabadi was arrested eight years ago with six other leaders of the Baha'i community and sentenced to 20 years in prison, for charges including espionage. Outraged conservatives have denounced Hashemi's meeting and criticised the moderate former president Rafsanjani, along with some reformists in Iranian politics.

Rafsanjani himself has acknowledged his daughter had "made a mistake that needs to be corrected", according to local media. "The Baha'i sect was created by the colonialists," he said. "This is a deviant sect... that we disavow and have always done."

But Faezeh said in an interview with Euronews Persian television that she had only visited "a friend". "It was a normal and harmless visit. I just visited a friend, that's all," she said.

Faezeh first met Kamalabadi when she herself was in jail in 2012 on charges of "propaganda against the regime". But Grand Ayatollah Nasser Makarem Shirazi said Monday she should face prosecution, while merchants of the Grand Bazaar, a pillar of the regime, have launched a petition demanding the Tehran prosecutor take action, according to Iranian media. The controversy comes as Washington on Saturday called on Tehran to release the seven leaders of the Baha'i minority faith. John Kirby, spokesman for the State Department, also called on Tehran to "guarantee freedom of expression, religion, opinion and assembly for all citizens". The Baha'i sect, founded in the 19th century in Iran, is not recognised by the authorities of the Islamic republic. They are regarded as "heretics" and "spies" linked to Israel, because their centre is located in the northern Israeli city of Haifa. Haifa on the Mediterranean seats the famous gardens of the Bahai World Centre, a pilgrimage site for the Bahai community. In Iran, Bahai's do not have the right to higher education, to take up jobs in the government, or to hold group worshipping sessions.—AFP

NETANYAHU CALLS MINISTER TO ORDER OVER ARMY FREEDOM OF SPEECH

JERUSALEM: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu called his Defense Minister Moshe Yaalon to order yesterday at a time of tensions over the right of military officers to speak their minds.

Yaalon on Sunday delivered a speech to senior officers in which he implored them to "continue speaking your minds". "Do so even if your remarks aren't part of the mainstream, and even if they are at odds with ideas and stances held by the senior command or political echelon," Yaalon said.

His remarks were perceived as a public show of support for Major General Yair Golan, deputy head of the armed forces,

who on the eve of Holocaust Remembrance Day this month made remarks comparing contemporary Israeli society to Nazi Germany. Yaalon had stood up for Golan, stressing that military commanders should not only "lead soldiers into battle" but also teach them "values, with a compass and conscience".

Netanyahu had criticized the deputy chief of staff's "outrageous" remarks as "utterly mistaken and unacceptable", adding however a few days later that "the affair is behind us". Sources described by Israeli media as "close to Netanyahu" said following Yaalon's speech the premier was surprised his defense minister was raising the issue of Golan's speech again, and Netanyahu summoned Yaalon to a meeting yesterday. A statement released by Netanyahu's office late Sunday reiterated that Golan's comparison was an "inappropriate remark" that harmed Israel internationally. Following yesterday's meeting, the offices of Netanyahu and Yaalon issued a joint statement saying the two had clarified issues. "There is no dispute, nor was there ever one, that the army is subordinate to the political echelon, and officers are free to express their opinions in the relevant forums," the statement read.

Politics about military

The military establishment has been taking an active stance in publicly defining the parameters of morality amid a wave of Palestinian violence, at times to the chagrin or rightwing ministers and lawmakers.

Since October last year, 204 Palestinians and 28 Israelis have been killed, according to an AFP count. Most of the Palestinians killed were carrying out knife, gun or carramming attacks, Israeli authorities say.

The chief-of-staff, Lieutenant General Gadi Eisenkot, angered politicians in February with remarks warning young soldiers not to use excessive force in subduing suspected Palestinian assailants. And the top brass, as well as Yaalon, strongly condemned Elor Azaria, a soldier standing trial in military court for shooting dead a prone and wounded Palestinian assailant, even before the trial began.

Rightwing politicians, including the Education Minister Naftali Bennett, defended the soldier, saying "he is not a murderer," while thousands of Israelis marched in support of him.

Ben Caspit, a columnist for the Mariv newspaper, called it a "cultural war" at the centre of Netanyahu's government-one of the most rightwing in Israel's history. "This is war of the few against the many. Yaalon has been standing almost entirely alone in the fray," he wrote. "Prime Minister Netanyahu, his ministers, and almost all the Likud MPs are facing off against him."

Political calculations have also fed the row-Israeli media have speculated that Yaalon could be planning to leave Likud and form his own party. Netanyahu is also reportedly in negotiations with two prominent opposition leaders about joining his government, which has only a one-seat majority in the 120-member parliament.

Israeli media have speculated that Netanyahu might offer up the defense

IRAQ LAUNCHES OPERATION TO RETAKE ANBAR TOWN

BAGHDAD: Iraqi security forces and allied fighters launched an operation yesterday to retake the town of Rutba from the Islamic State jihadist group, the military said. Special forces, soldiers, police, border guards and pro-government paramilitaries are involved in the operation to retake the Anbar province town, Iraq's Joint Operations Command said in a statement.

Tanks and artillery are taking part in the operation, which is also backed by air support from Iraqi forces and the US-led coalition against IS, it said. Rutba, located in western Anbar province along the main road to Jordan, has been held by the jihadist group since 2014. "Rutba's important to the enemy because it's another support zone for them," said Colonel Steve Warren, the spokesman for the US-led operation against IS.

IS uses it "to stage and prepare forces for operations in... the main battle area," Warren told journalists in Baghdad last week. "It's not heavily defended as is Fallujah or as was Ramadi," he said, referring to the capital of Anbar, which has been retaken, and its second city, which IS still holds. Warren said the number of IS fighters in Rutba varies from around 100 up to several hundred, and that once the Iraqis "decide they want to liberate Rutba, they'll be able to." IS overran large areas north and west of Baghdad in June of that year, and later made further advances in Anbar, seizing Ramadi in 2015. Iraqi forces have since regained significant ground from the jihadists, securing the Ramadi area earlier this year and retaking the town of Heet last month. But parts of Anbar-including Fallujah-are still under IS control, as is most of Nineveh province, to its north. And the jihadists are still able to carry out bombings in government-held areas-something they did more frequently prior to the June 2014 offensive. As IS continues to lose ground, it has in recent weeks stepped up its campaign of bombings, including three in Baghdad last Wednesday that killed nearly 100 people.—AFP

ISLAMIST MILITANTS EXPLOIT CHAOS AS COMBATANTS PURSUE PEACE IN YEMEN

CAIRO/DUBAI: Islamic State efforts to exploit chaos may have have brought Saudi-backed forces and Iran-allied Houthis tentatively closer at peace talks in Yemen's civil war, but a deal seems unlikely in time to avert collapse into armed, feuding statelets. Ferocious conflict along Yemen's northern border between Saudi Arabia and Iran-allied Ansurallah, a Shi'ite Muslim revival movement also called the Houthis, defied two previous attempts to seal a peace. But a truce this year and prisoner exchanges mean hopes for a third round of talks are higher. The threat from an emerging common enemy may be galvanizing their efforts. Islamic State appears to be behind a dizzying uptick in suicide attacks and al Qaeda fighters continue to hold sway over broad swathes of the country that abuts Saudi Arabia, the world's biggest oil exporter.

Saudi Foreign Minister Adel al-Jubeir said on Thursday the kingdom sought to prioritize fighting militants in Yemen over its desultory arm-wrestle with entrenched Houthi insurgents. "Whether we agree or disagree with them, the Houthis are part of the social fabric of Yemen ... The Houthis are our neighbours. Al Qaeda and Daesh are terrorist entities that must be confronted in Yemen and everywhere else," Jubeir tweeted, using the Arabic acronym for Islamic State.

Now largely stalemated, the conflict has killed at least 6,200 people - half of them civilians - and sent nearly three million people fleeing for safety. Despite the relative lull during talks, hostility continues. Saudi Arabia has pounded its enemies with dozens of air strikes. Houthis have responded with two ballistic missile launches.

If the parties seize the opportunity, an unlikely new status quo may reign by which Houthis and Saudis depend on each other for peace. "This could mean a massive reordering of Yemen's political structure, and the conflict so far has already produced some strange bedfellows," said Adam Baron, a visiting fellow at the European Council on Foreign Relations.

The Houthis ousted the internationally recognized government in 2014 in what it hailed as a revolution but which Sunni Gulf Arab countries decried as a coup benefiting Shi'ite rival Iran. Pounding the Houthis and their allies in Yemen's army with air strikes beginning on March of 2015, a Saudi-led alliance soon deployed ground troops and rolled back their enemies toward Sanaa, held by the Houthis. A near-blockade imposed by the Saudi-led coalition and frontlines which ebb and flow across villages and towns have deprived nearly 20 of 25 million people of access to clean water and put yet more in need of some form of humanitarian aid.

"Surrender"

Of the countries where pro-democracy "Arab Spring" uprisings in 2011 ultimately led to outright combat, Yemen's United Nationssponsored peace process arguably shows the most promise.

Unlike with Libya and Syria, representatives of Yemen's warring sides meet daily in Kuwait and argue over how to implement UN Security Council resolutions and share power. But while keeping Yemen's parties talking for this long was an accomplishment, getting them to live together in Sanaa and share power remains a distant dream. Yemeni Foreign Minister Abdel-Malek al-Mekhlafi accused the Houthis of resisting a UN Security Council Resolution from last April to disarm and vacate main cities. "There is a wide gap in the debate, we are discussing the return of the state ... they are thinking only of power and demanding a consensual government," he told Reuters.

Houthi spokesman Mohammed Abdel-Salam said on his facebook page: "The solution in Yemen must be consensual political dialogue and not imposing diktats or presenting terms of surrender, this is unthinkable." But a diplomatic source in Kuwait said that through the fog of rhetoric, a general outline of a resolution has been reached.

"There is an agreement on the withdrawal from the cities and the (Houthi) handover of weapons, forming a government of all parties and preparing for new elections. The dispute now only centres around where to begin," the source said.

Feuding statelets

All parties will be aware the danger of a collapse into feuding statelets is growing. The Houthis are deepening control over what remains of the shattered state it seized with the capital in 2014.

Footage of the graduation ceremony of an elite police unit last week showed recruits with right arms upraised in an erect salute, barking allegiance not just to Yemen but to Imam Ali and the slain founder of the Houthi movement - a move critics say proves their partisan agenda for the country.—Reuters **DIYARBAKIR, TURKEY:** Yesterday Turkish authorities were working to confirm the fates of at least 12 civilians who are missing and feared dead after a huge blast last week blamed on Kurdish rebels in the southeast of the country, reports and official sources said.

The mainly Kurdish region of Diyarbakir was on Thursday night rocked by a massive explosion that was also felt in the city centre and was later said to have been caused by Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) militants loading explosives onto a truck. Four people, all PKK militants, were confirmed by the authorities to have been killed in the blast, which the interior ministry said was caused by explosives detonating prematurely. But the local governor's office later confirmed media reports that 12 citizens were still missing after the immense blast, which left a gigantic crater in the ground.

The Dogan news agency reported yesterday that some 15 tons of explosives had detonated in the incident and that 13 local residents were still missing. It said the authorities had conducted three investigations of the scene, collecting body parts from a half kilometer area which were sent to Istanbul for analysis and DNA identification.

An AFP correspondent who visited the scene on Friday saw body parts still strewn around the area and was told by villagers that up to 16 people were missing. In a statement, the PKK also said the explosion was accidental, claiming the vehicle exploded when anti-PKK villagers opened fire on the truck and hit its fuses. The group said the explosives were meant to be transferred to another location and not detonated. It offered condolences to the families of the bystanders who died but said it was not to blame for the loss of life. Turkey has been waging an offensive against the PKK after the collapse in 2015 of a two-year ceasefire declared by the group. Hundreds of members of the Turkish security forces have been killed in attacks since then although civilian deaths in the conflict have rarely been confirmed

Over 40,000 people have been killed since the PKK took up arms in 1984 demanding a homeland for Turkey's biggest minority. Since then, the group has pared back its demands to focus on cultural rights and a measure of autonomy.—AFP

TRIAL BEGINS FOR Ohio State Band Instructor In Rape Case

COLUMBUS: A trial is set to begin for a drum major instructor for Ohio State University's marching band who's accused of sexually assaulting a student.

Stewart Kitchen has pleaded not guilty to charges including rape. His attorney has said that he would "vigorously defend" his client against the allegations. Court documents allege the assault occurred in April 2015 after Kitchen and the 19-year-old woman went out drinking and then walked to his Columbus home. The woman reported that Kitchen refused to return her to her home and sexually assaulted her in his bedroom.

Kitchen was indicted less than a year after Ohio State fired the band's director after an investigation determined he ignored "a sexualized culture" in the band. The trial began yesterday.—AP

FIRST US PENIS TRANSPLANT PERFORMED ON 64-YEAR-OLD MAN

WASHINGTON: A 64-year-old man who lost most of his penis to cancer is recovering well after undergoing the United States' first penis transplant operation, doctors said yesterday.

The 15-hour surgery took place earlier this month at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, and is the third such operation known in the world.

"The patient, Thomas Manning, 64, of Halifax, Massachusetts, continues to recover well, with blood flow established to the donor organ and no signs of bleeding, rejection or infection," the hospital said in a statement. "While the patient is still early in the postsurgical healing process, his physicians say they are cautiously optimistic he will regain function that he lost in 2012" after a penile cancer diagnosis led to most of his penis being amputated.

The penis came from a dead donor who matched Manning's blood type and skin tone. Manning expressed his gratitude to the donor and his family, which has asked to remain anonymous, and said he wanted to go public with his story to eliminate the shame and stigma associated with the loss of a penis. "In sharing this success with all of you, it's my hope we can usher in a bright future for this type of transplantation," Manning said in a statement.

Doctors at Massachusetts General have been working on the procedure for more than three years, including practicing on cadavers, with the goal of perfecting the method before they offer it to a wider pool of candidates, particularly soldiers who sustained genital damage or loss in war zones.

In an interview with The New York Times, Manning said doctors discovered he had a rare form of penile cancer in 2012. After removing the tumor, he was left with a stump about an inch long (2.5 centimeters). Manning, who was single when he was diagnosed with cancer, had to sit in order to urinate and was fearful of becoming intimate with a woman. "I wouldn't go near anybody," he was quoted as saying. "I couldn't have a relationship with anybody. You can't tell a woman, 'I had a penis amputation.""

The first penis transplant in the world took place in China in 2006, but it was later removed due to "a severe psychological problem of the recipient and his wife," doctors said. The world's first successful penis transplant was announced last year in South Africa. The donated organ was grafted onto a 21year-old man who lost his penis in a botched circumcision. —AFP

WASHINGTON: Months after he savaged her on Twitter and elsewhere, Donald Trump tells Fox News anchor Megyn Kelly that people who are bullied "gotta get over it" and fight back.

In an excerpt of the interview, which will be on the Fox network Tuesday night, Trump says he's a counterpuncher who goes after people when they go after him, only 10 times harder. Asked if he was ever bullied, the Republican presidential candidate said no. But he said bullying doesn't just happen to children. "People are bullied when they're 55," he said.

Kelly responded pointedly, with a smile: "Can happen when you're 45." She is 45. "You know, it happens, right?" Trump went on, as if he didn't hear her. "But you gotta get over it. Fight back, do whatever you have to do."

Trump took offense when Kelly confronted him in the first primary debate about crude

remarks he'd made about women. He later suggested her menstrual cycle was behind her aggressive tone, called her "third-rate" and boycotted one of the debates at which she was a moderator, as his feud with Fox News escalated.

In the released excerpt, the two did not directly discuss his criticisms of her. She told ABC's "Good Morning America" on Monday the tone of the interview was cordial, with tense moments, and predicted viewers "will be feeling a little uncomfortable." Kelly said she asked for the interview because she wanted to get her interactions with Trump on a professional footing. "You don't want to be the story," she said. "You want to cover the story."

Ex discredits NYT story A woman at the center of a New York Times

piece detailing Republican Donald Trump's history with women took issue with the story yesterday, saying she never had a negative experience with the billionaire and does not believe he ever mistreated women. Rowanne Brewer Lane, a former model who dated Trump for several months starting in the late 1990, said her words were mischaracterized in the Times article, which used dozens of interviews to show a pattern of unsettling personal behavior by the presidential candidate with women. The Times story said Trump, the presumptive Republican nominee for the Nov. 8 election, asked Lane to change into a bikini shortly after meeting her at a pool party at his Mar-a-Lago estate in Florida. According to the article, he then introduced her to the crowd outside, saying, "That is a stunning Trump girl, isn't it?"

On yesterday, Lane told the same story but

said she had been flattered by his comment. "They spun it to where it appeared negative," Lane said on Fox News. "I did not have a negative experience with Donald Trump." Trump has deflected criticism about his attitude toward women throughout his campaign. Yesterday, he called the New York Times "so dishonest." "Their hit piece cover story on me yesterday was just blown up by Rowanne Brewer, who said it was a lie!" Trump posted on Twitter.

Times reporters Michael Barbaro and Megan Twohey defended their story on CBS "This Morning," saying it showed how Trump behaved privately with women and revealed common themes, including unwelcome advances, aggression and commentary on their appearance. "People can evaluate the story ... on its own merits," Barbaro said.—Agencies

SUPREME COURT AVOIDS MAJOR RULING IN BIRTH CONTROL DISPUTE

WASHINGTON: The Supreme Court rid itself yesterday of a knotty dispute between faith-based groups and the Obama administration over birth control. The court asked lower courts to take another look at the issue in a search for a compromise. The justices issued an unsigned, unanimous opinion in a case over the arrangement devised by the administration to spare faith-based groups from having to pay for birth control for women covered under their health plans. The major confrontation over an element of President Barack Obama's health care law ended with a whimper and with no resolution of the issue the court undertook to decide. "The court expresses no view on the merits of the cases," the justices wrote.

The matter almost certainly would not return to the Supreme Court until after the 2016 presidential election. The outcome suggests the court lacked a majority for a significant ruling and is perhaps another example of how the justices have been affected by the death of Justice Antonin Scalia. In the short term, the government can take steps to make sure that women covered by the groups' health plans have access to cost-free contraceptives. At the same time, the groups will not face fines for refusing to comply with administration rules for objecting to paying for birth control.—AP

BERNIE SANDERS VISITS PUERTO RICO AMID DEBT CRISIS

SAN JUAN: Yesterday Democratic presidential candidate Bernie Sanders arrived in Puerto Rico to talk about the US territory's worsening debt crisis ahead of the June 5 primary. The Vermont senator was expected to present an economic recovery plan for the island and talk about the crisis' impact on its education and health systems. Sanders' visit comes a day before former US President Bill Clinton arrives to campaign for his wife, Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton.


Some 250 people crowded into Sanders' first event, including former Puerto Rico governor Anibal Acevedo Vila and other supporters who expressed frustration with Puerto Rico's economic situation.

Jose Hernandez, a 62-year-old retiree, arrived early to set up signs supporting Sanders. "Bernie pushed me into action," he said. "I was gone from Puerto Rico for 17 years and when I came back everything was the same or worse. His message convinced me. It's the first time I hear a candidate speak with such humanity, dignity and respect."

Puerto Ricans can vote in US primaries but not in US presidential elections. More than 200,000 Puerto Ricans have left the island in the past five years to escape a decade-long economic crisis. The majority of them have moved to the US mainland.—AP

GERMAN 'GODFATHERS' REUNITE SYRIAN FAMILIES

reunion with his younger son in Berlin, a 71-year-old Syrian handed a bar of olive oil and laurel soap, a hand-made wall hanging and a box of pistachio sweets to a 56-year-old German he had never met before. The gifts were from Aleppo, the city devastated by five years of war which he and his elder son had been able to leave thanks to the German, engineer and father of four, Martin Figur. Figur is one of the "Godfathers for Refugees", matched with the family by a non-profit organization of the same name that seeks sponsors to help Syrians already in Germany to bring their relatives here.

"During the war, the Germans - government and people - have shown they are closer friends of the Syrian people than the Arabs," the Syrian father told Figur at their meeting, which was witnessed by Reuters. He declined to give his name to protect relatives still living in the fiercely contested city.

Tight border controls across Europe, stricter asylum rules, and an EU-Turkey

BERLIN: Three days after an emotional deal to clamp down on migrant sea crossings to Greece have left many Syrians in Germany struggling for ways to help relatives still in their homeland make it to safety. The arrival of more than a million migrants into Germany last year prompted the German government to tighten asylum rules, including a two-year ban on family reunions for those granted limited refugee status, making the situation worse. Martin Keune, the owner of an advertising agency, founded Godfathers for Refugees last year after two Syrian asylum seekers he was housing begged him to help them bring in their parents.

Keune was inspired by the story of his wife's Jewish uncle, who survived the Holocaust thanks to a British couple who adopted him while the rest of his family were sent from Berlin to the Nazi death camp in Krakow, in Nazi-occupied Poland, where they perished.

At Berlin's Schoenefeld airport on Saturday, the Syrian father's younger son Mohannad, who has been in Germany since 2006, held back tears as he greeted ed, but healthy and you are breathing and that is the most important thing," he said, pressing his hand on his father's arm.

Desperate

Mohannad, 36, came to Germany ten years ago on a cultural exchange programme and had been trying to reunite his family since 2012. "When I started looking into laws on family reunions, I became desperate," he said.

His net monthly salary at a Berlinbased charity for refugees is less than the minimum of 2,160 euros (\$2,460.24) the authorities say a sponsor must earn to bring in just one family member. That is about the average net salary in Germany.

Since March 2015, the Godfathers' group has found sponsors for 103 Syrians, two-thirds of whom are already with family members in Berlin. The rest are waiting to receive two-year residency permits at German consulates in Lebanon and Turkey. The association can only sponsor Syrians who have at least one close family

his father and brother. "You look exhaust- member, such as a spouse, a child, a parent or a sibling, who has been in Germany for at least one year.

> It relies on crowd funding and donations from its 2,200 members to raise the 800 euros a month it needs for each Syrian. This covers rent, health insurance, and a 400-euro stipend, equal to what the government pays unemployed Germans.

> The godfathers do not fund the Syrian newcomers directly but take on legal liability for their living costs for five years even if in the meantime they apply for asylum and are granted full refugee status. Figur signed a "Declaration of Commitment" at the Foreigners' Registration Office in Berlin accepting liability for Mohannad's father, brother as well his mother, who is still in Aleppo. Germany took in some 1.1 million migrants last year, and of the more than 470,000 asylum applications filed over that period the largest group were Syrians, making up 35 percent.

> The influx has fuelled the rise of the anti-immigration party Alternative for Germany (AfD), which entered three state

parliaments in elections in March by luring voters angry with Chancellor Angela Merkel's welcoming approach toward refugees. "I can only encourage people to make contact with refugees, because only then will their attitudes change," said Figur, a Catholic, commending Merkel's courage in the refugee crisis.

A ceasefire in Aleppo, Syria's largest city and its main commercial centre before the war, has held since last week, making it easier for father and son to leave by land to Lebanon and on to Germany, a 20-hour journey.

They know they are lucky and hope mother, daughter and grandson - who have stayed behind at the wish of the son-in-law - will be able to join them soon in Berlin. They described the gifts to Figur as a gesture of gratitude for "helping strangers".

"Martin Figur helped us even though he did not know us," said Mohannad's brother, 38, pointing at his "godfather" with a smile. "And this is what I want to do in the future, help others."—Reuters

PRO-BIAFRACAMPAIGNERS ALLEGE BRUTAL CRACKDOWN

ABA, Nigeria: Chukwu Ebuka Moses is too young to remember the Nigerian civil war that began in 1967 and which by its end nearly three years later devastated the southeast, shattering dreams of an independent Biafran homeland. But the 19-year-old student believes he joined the ranks of Biafran war veterans when he was shot during a protest in the Abia state capital, Aba, on January 18.

Moses, fragile and limp, has to be carried to a black plastic chair under the shade of a thatched grass hut at an open bar. "We were defiantly, winning a chorus of approving murmurs from older men nearby. "Biafra must surely pass." Human rights lawyer Onkere Kingdom Nnamdi said more than 50 people have been killed, 100 injured and 200 detained in connection with protests calling for the release of Nnamdi Kanu.

Kanu, who leads the Indigenous People of Biafra (IPOB) movement, was arrested last October and has been in custody awaiting trial since December on charges of treasonable felony. But President Muhammadu Buhari has already said publicly Kanu has committed "atrocities" against the state and he "will not tolerate" threats to Nigeria's unity. Kanu's arrest and the government reaction has strengthened backing for IPOB beyond longstanding calls for more jobs, better health care and basic infrastructure in the southeast. Thousands of his supporters have flooded the streets of major southeast cities in an unprecedented show of solidarity in the past decade, demanding a separate state for the Igbo people that dominate the region. Buhari, a former military ruler, appears determined not to let that happen. Injured protestors at three separate IPOB rallies from November to February said armed police and soldiers released tear gas and shot at the crowd "indiscriminately" with live ammunition. — AFP

PORT ELIZABETH, THE S AFRICA CITY THAT HAS ZUMA QUAKING

PORT ELIZABETH, SOUTH AFRICA: Sitting in his wooden shack in a township in Port Elizabeth, Kwanele Mphelo reels off a list of gripes with South Africa's ruling African National Congress. "We feel left down by the government-especially the party that was supposed to represent the black people and take us out of poverty." "We have no water, no sanitation," the 39-year-old security guard said, adding that the brick house he was promised by the ANC-run townhall had never materialized either. Mphelo's views sum up a growing sentiment among voters in this one-time bastion of the former liberation movement.

Since 1994, when Nelson Mandela swept to power in South Africa's first democratic elections, the ANC has reigned supreme at the national and regional level, with only one city-Cape Town-escaping its clutches.

But change may be in the offing at local elections on August 3. With President Jacob Zuma reeling from a series of corruption scandals and court battles, the party's grip is looking tenuous in some cities, including Port Elizabeth. Suffering 36-percent unemployment, compared with a national average of 27 percent, South Africa's sixth-biggest city-a car manufacturing hub-has been hard hit by shrinking economic growth.

The main opposition Democratic Alliance (DA), which is in power in Cape Town, is hoping to harness the disillusionment of people like Mphelo to win control of the city at the upcoming municipal elections. During the last local elections in 2011, the DA polled 40 percent in Port Elizabeth, 11 points behind the ANC. By the 2014 general elections, the gap had narrowed to 48 percent for the ANC, to 42 for the liberal DA.

A 52-year-old white farmer who speaks both Afrikaans and Xhosa, the language of Eastern Cape's biggest ethnic group, Trollip is running for mayor in the election. He faces a formidable opponent in current mayor Danny Jordaan, the chief organizer of the 2010 World Cup in South Africa. The ANC is not resting on

Indian Ocean city, Zuma chose it last month to host the launch of the party's campaign for the local elections.

Sweden: Refugee from Rwanda **CONVICTED IN 1994 GENOCIDE**

STOCKHOLM: A Swedish citizen originally from Rwanda was sentenced to life in prison Monday for his role in the 1994 genocide in the African country.

Claver Berinkindi was found guilty of genocide and gross violation of international law. Some 800,000 people, mostly ethnic Tutsis, were killed by Hutu extremists during the Rwandan genocide, according to the UN. The Stockholm district court said Berinkindi, 61, was an informal lowlevel Hutu leader who took part in massacres of civilians in Muyira and Butare in southern Rwanda.

Berinkindi was ordered to pay a total of 81 million Rwandan francs (about \$110,000) in damages to 15 plaintiffs who survived the attacks or whose close relatives were killed. "Never before has a Swedish court awarded damages for victims of acts of genocide," the court said in a statement. Berinkindi's lawyer, Hanna Lindblom, said her client, who denied the charges, would appeal the ruling. "He was in his home village when these horrible events took place. But he has not participated in genocide. He was at home," Lindblom told The Associated Press.

Rwandan authorities initially wanted to prosecute Berinkindi there but since he's a Swedish citizen he couldn't be extradited. He and his family came to Sweden as refugees in 2002 and he became a Swedish citizen 10 years later. Swedish police arrested Berinkindi in September 2014 after wiretapping his phone.

MASS CAR RAPES WILL SCAR GENERATIONS

THE HAGUE: The effects of a deliberate campaign of mass rapes in the Central African Republic by the forces of former Congolese vice president Jean-Pierre Bemba a decade ago will be felt for generations, war crimes judges heard Monday. Research among scores of victims from the 2002-2003 violence showed "alarmingly high rates of post-traumatic stress disorder," US expert Daryn Reicherter told the International Criminal Court (ICC). War crimes judges in The Hague are holding three days of hearings to determine their sentence on Bemba after he was convicted of five charges of war crimes and crimes against humanity.

The five months of brutality unleashed by Bemba's Liberation Movement (MLC) in a bid to put down an attempted coup in CAR had caused "appalling" and "almost certainly long-lasting damage" to the population, Reicherter said. "A single individual rape can be felt across multiple generations," he insisted, appearing for the prosecution. The stress of such an ordeal can cause actual biological changes in a victim's brain, leaving them more vulnerable to PTSD and serious psychological problems.

There were also often several tragic outcomes including the breakdown of marriages, potentially leaving victims struggling on their own to care for their families.

Child rape victims suffered even greater damage, he warned. Bemba's case is the first before the ICC to focus on sexual violence as a weapon of war, as well as to stress a military commander's responsibility for the action of his troops.

In their March verdict, the judges listed a chilling litany of rapes, murders and atrocities committed in CAR by MLC troops.

'Terror and torture'

Men, women and children were all raped-in

one case three generations of the same family were gang-raped by MLC soldiers who held them at gun point and forced relatives to watch. "This was not about sexual gratification, this was about terror and torture," the expert from Stanford University, California, said.

It was "more about humiliation and control of a population," he added. After a lengthy trial which opened in November 2010, the judges found Bemba guilty on all charges in March.

The three judges found the notorious rebel leader had retained "effective command and control" over the 1,500 MLC troops he sent to CAR to quell an attempted coup against then president Ange-Felix Patasse.

Catholic Bishop Fridolin Ambongo, appearing earlier for the defense as a character witness, sought to show that Bemba and the MLC had played a role in bringing "peace and stability" to the northwestern Equateur province of Democratic Republic of Congo.

While he said he had no knowledge of what had happened in neighboring CAR, in his DR Congo province the MLC forces had "made it possible for the population to feel peace finally, because the MLC came to re-establish everything that had been destroyed."

The judges will pass sentence at an as yet unscheduled date, after also hearing this week from two victims. But Bemba could face up to 30 years in jail-or even a life sentence, if the court considers such a term is "justified by the extreme gravity of the crime". A wealthy businessmanturned-warlord, Bemba became one of four vice presidents in the transitional government of DR Congo President Joseph Kabila.

In 2006, he lost to Kabila in a presidential election run-off and fled to Europe. He was arrested in 2008 in Brussels and handed over to the ICC. His MLC militia has since morphed into a political party and is currently the second-largest opposition group in the National Assembly. - AFP

GUYANA CRACKING DOWN ON CONTRABAND IN PRISONS

GEORGETOWN, GUYANA: The South American nation of Guyana is trying to impose more order on its overcrowded prison system following an uptick of people hurling contraband to inmates in recent days.

Security Minister Khemraj Ramjattan said yesterday that wardens are conducting frequent lockdowns and more searches after suspected weapons, drugs and phones were pitched over prison walls. He says authorities

will show inmates "who is the real boss." Ramjattan says no guns have been found in recent searches. But wardens have found screwdrivers and other improvised weapons.

The latest security crackdown comes about two months after a riot killed 17 inmates and injured several guards at the country's biggest prison. Inmates had set mattresses on fire to protest prison conditions and trial delays. — AP

EXIT POLLS SEE INDIA'S MODI WINNING KEY NEW STATE IN MID-TERM BOOST

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's BJP party should win power this week in the northeastern state of Assam for the first time, exit polls showed yesterday, but trail regional groups in four other areas that have held polls.

Voting in stages over the past month ended yesterday in Assam, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Kerala states and the union territory of Puducherry. Results are due on Thursday. A victory in Assam, a tinderbox of ethnic and religious animosities, would testify to the continuing appeal of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), while defeat elsewhere would reflect Modi's difficulties in making inroads against popular regional parties.

An exit poll by India Today-Axis My India predicted victory for the BJP in Assam, which borders Bhutan and Bangladesh. "Our historic victory in Assam will open new frontiers for the BJP in the northeast," BJP national general secretary Ram Madhav said.

Modi waged a polarising election campaign in a bid to form the party's first government there. In campaign rallies, he vowed to disenfranchise millions of Muslim immigrants in a response to rising discontent among the state's Hindus. The results should be a snapshot of Modi's performance as he approaches the half-way mark of his five-year tenure.

Modi, 65, swept to power in 2014 with a promise of jobs and growth, playing down his roots in the powerful Hindu-nationalist umbrella group to which his party is affiliated. A separate poll by ABP Ananda showed the party will be defeated in the eastern state of West Bengal and two southern states, Tamil Nadu and Kerala.

Victory in these states could have given Modi greater control over the upper house of parliament, which would put him in better position to push through key policies. A majority of his key economic reforms are stalled, his push to turn the country into a manufacturing powerhouse has floundered and sizeable minority groups blame him and his party for pushing a Hindu nationalist agenda at their expense.

Yet his government has made progress elsewhere, most notably in the power sector where change is reaching distressed rural communities in Uttar Pradesh, India's most populous state. Modi must win in the Uttar Pradesh state poll next year to sustain his hope of one day gaining full control of parliament and a second term in 2019.

Opinion and exit polls have a patchy track record in India and surveys get carried out with sample sizes ranging from a few hundred to several thousand voters. — Reuters

KABUL LOCKED DOWN AS MINORITY HAZARAS PROTEST OVER POWER LINE

KABUL: Tens of thousands of minority Shiite Hazaras demonstrated through the streets of Kabul yesterday, demanding that a key power transmission line pass through their electricity-starved province, in the second major antigovernment protest in recent months.

Authorities locked down central Kabul, blocking key intersections with stacked shipping containers as the protesters marched on the presidential palace, holding unlit lanterns and banners with slogans such as "justice and light". The demonstration, which spotlights the war-torn nation's turbulent politics, follows one of the biggest anti-government rallies for years last November, which was galvanised by the beheading of a group of Hazaras.

Some protesters pelted rocks at officials and banged on the sides of containers, prompting police to sporadically use water cannon against them but the demonstration was largely peaceful. "(President) Ashraf Ghani is hiding himself behind blast walls," Dawood Naji, a Hazara leader, told flag-waving demonstrators, drawing rousing applause. "We can break down these containers if we want but we are here to protest in a civilised way for our rights."

Authorities shut down roads to the presidential palace, fearing a repeat of the violence in November when protesters tried to scale the walls of the compound. The 500-kilovolt TUTAP power line, which would connect the Central Asian nations of Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and Tajikistan with electricity-hungry Afghanistan and Pakistan, is seen as a crucial infrastructure project.

But it has been mired in controversy, with leaders from the minority group demanding that the line be routed through Bamiyan, one of the most deprived areas of Afghanistan with a large Hazara population.

The line was originally set to pass through the central province but the government rerouted it through the mountainous Salang pass north of Kabul, saying the shorter route would speed up the project and save millions of dollars. Hazara leaders in the ethnically divided nation lashed out at the Pashtun president, calling the decision prejudiced against the Hazaras, a community that has suffered a long history of oppression.

Persecuted community

"Bamiyan has seen no development in 15 years (since the Taleban were toppled from power)," Hazara lawmaker Arif Rahmani told AFP. "We are demanding justice, not charity."

Ghani has appointed a commission to review the multi-million-dollar project and

assured the protesters that Bamiyan would receive electricity from it even if the transmission line does not pass through the province.

The rally comes in the midst of the Taleban's annual spring offensive launched last month and authorities said the streets were blocked with shipping containers to prevent any insurgent attacks during the protests. The dispute, which highlights the challenges of modernizing the country, threatens to overshadow the TUTAP project, which is due to be implemented by 2018 and could help ease crippling nationwide blackouts. yesterday's protest underscores Ghani's rising unpopularity amid endemic corruption, rampant unemployment and a worsening 15vear Taleban insurgency.

Hazara protesters last week repeatedly heckled Ghani during an anti-corruption summit in London. The three million-strong Afghan Hazara community has been persecuted for decades, with thousands killed in the late 1990s by Al-Qaeda and the mainly Pashtun and Sunni Taleban.

There has been a surge in violence against the community, with a series of kidnappings and killings in recent months that have triggered a wave of fury on social media. Last November thousands of protesters marched coffins containing the decapitated bodies of seven Hazaras through the Afghan capital.

Their bodies were found in the southern province of Zabul, which is under Taleban control and has been the scene of clashes between rival militant factions. Ghani called the killings "the shared pain of a nation" and accused the militants of trying to divide Afghanistan. — AFP

PAKISTAN TO HOST MEETING ON **REVIVING AFGHAN TALEBAN TALKS**

ISLAMABAD: Tomorrow Pakistan will host a new round of four-nation Afghan peace talks aimed at reviving long-stalled negotiations with the Taleban, a foreign office official said.

The group comprising Afghanistan, the United States, China and Pakistan has been attempting since January to restart the nascent peace process. But the lack of progress has left many frustrated, as the Taleban ramp up their insurgency, launched in late-2001 after they were toppled from power by a US-led invasion.

A spokesman from Pakistan's foreign office, Mohammed Nafees Zakaria, however tweeted that a fifth round of talks between the four countries would take place in Islamabad on tomorrow, without giving

further details. A joint statement issued after the fourth round in late February said direct peace talks between Kabul and the Taleban were "expected to take place" by early March. But the Taleban announced in April the start of their "spring offensive" even as the government in Kabul tried to bring the insurgents back to the negotiating table to end their drawn-out conflict.

The Taleban have made the departure of all foreign forces a precondition to the resumption of direct peace talks with Kabul which began last summer in Pakistan but ended abruptly after it was revealed that their leader Mullah Omar had been dead for two years. Pakistan had hosted a milestone first round of direct talks with the Taleban in July last year. — AFP

PAKISTAN'S PM DEFENDS HIS FINANCES, SUGGESTS PANAMA PROBE

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's prime minister defended his financial record yesterday, denying that he used any Pakistani funds to buy property in London or establish a steel mill in Saudi Arabia.

Nawaz Sharif's speech came against the backdrop of the Panama papers, leaked financial documents indicating that his children hold offshore assets worth millions of dollars. Speaking to parliament after he faced mounting pressure from the opposition to clarify his financial situation, Sharif denied any wrongdoing.

Sharif said his father built up the family business before the premier entered politics and established a steel mill abroad while he was in exile. The Jeddah steel mill was then sold in 2005 for \$17 million, and the proceeds were used to buy the apartments in London, Sharif said.

He also presented details of his and his family's tax affairs. Yet shortly after Sharif's speech concluded, leader of the opposition Syed Khursheed Shah accused him of dodging questions and led a walk-out in protest. The opposition had wanted more details on Sharif's finances, included the money trail leading to his overseas properties.

Sharif said a committee comprising government and opposition lawmakers should be formed to prepare for a judicial probe into all those mentioned in the Panama papers - a trove of leaked documents from Panama-based law firm Mossack Fonseca - including members of his family. He has already written to the country's chief justice to create this probe, and to look into corruption and tax evasion by politicians and others.

The opposition argued that it wants the judicial probe to be confined to the Panama papers and to largely focus on Sharif's family. The leaked papers have also named other Pakistani politicians and businessmen alleged to have substantial undeclared overseas assets. — AP

Showing disrespect toward North Korean leader Kim Jong Un or former leaders, criticizing the government, having an unauthorized interaction with residents, taking unapproved photographs and shopping at certain stores have all been considered crimes, the department said. Americans traveling there should not expect protection from tour groups or guides or have expectation of privacy, it added. — Reuters

QUAKE HITS TOKYO AREA

TOKYO: A strong earthquake with a preliminary magnitude of 5.6 on the Richter scale struck eastern Japan yesterday, including Tokyo, the Japan Meteorological Agency said. However, there were no immediate reports of major damage. No tsunami warning was issued for the 9:23 p.m. (1223 GMT) quake. Operators of nuclear power plants in the affected areas said there were no signs of abnormalities at the facilities from the quake.

Shinkansen bullet train service on some routes were briefly suspended, but resumed afterwards. The government set up a taskforce at the prime minister's office to collect information.

The focus of the tremor was 40 km underground in southern part of Ibaraki Prefecture, about 40 km northeast of Tokyo, according to the agency. The quake registered lower 5 on the Japanese seismic scale of 7 in Omitama City. The agency defines an intensity of lower 5 as strong enough to make hanging objects swing violently and most unstable ornaments fall.

In wide areas of Tokyo, the quake registered 3 on the Japanese seismic scale. The Japanese scale measures how much places were shaken on the surface while the Richter scale measures the energy of the quake itself. — KUNA



EX-COP CHARGED IN GRISLY THAI KILLING LINKED TO MASS GRAVE

BANGKOK: A former policeman in Thailand has been charged with murdering a woman whose fate led to the discovery of a suspected mass grave, police said yesterday.

Reports about a large burial site in the northeast, where criminal gangs may have dumped bodies for years, have swirled in the local media in recent weeks. The investigation began when the daughter of a woman who was strangled in June 2014 took reporters to a remote jungle area where her mother's burned corpse was first discovered.

She said she wanted to highlight what she described as a lack of police interest in investigating the killing. During the visit reporters found bones that looked human. Subsequent police investigations have uncovered at least nine possible sites containing bones, some of them certified as human, while 41 people with missing relatives have come forward to offer DNA samples.

At a press conference in the northeastern city of Khon Kaen, officers yesterday announced two people including a former policeman had been charged with the June 2014 murder. "We know two people were involved. One was Pramote, a former policeman and one was a suspect we have here today (called) Boonna," said Police Major General Yanyong Vetkosol.

Boonna admitted being involved in the woman's killing, saying she had a dispute with the former police officer about money. It is common practice in Thailand for suspects who admit their guilt to be presented to the media. Investigators added that Pramote is already serving jail time for another murder. Police have been at pains to distance themselves from any suggestion their officers may be linked to killings or to a mass grave site.

The country's police have long had a reputation for corruption, with many Thais likening them to a mafia in uniform. Thailand's junta chief, a former head of the army, has vowed to clean up the police and has transferred or sacked a number of highprofile officers.

Police in Khon Kaen said more time was needed to investigate the potential mass grave and discover whether the remains are from missing people. —AFP

BEIJING: Yesterday China said landlocked Afghanistan has expressed support for Beijing's stance on the South China Sea dispute, the latest country from outside the region to line up behind China's calls for bilateral talks on the issue. The Foreign Ministry said Afghanistan Chief Executive Abdullah Abdullah made the statement in a meeting with Chinese Premier Li Keqiang in Beijing that also touched on security cooperation along their border in China's volatile western region of Xinjiang.

"Our Afghan counterparts expressed their gratitude for China's long-term support over the years, and also said they support China's position on the South China Sea issue and support China's efforts to resolve the South China Sea issue through bilateral channels and through peaceful means such as negotiation and consultation," the deputy director general of the ministry's department of Asian Affairs, Hou Yanqi, told reporters following the talks. Hou said Li also expressed China's willingness to help with Afghanistan's national reconciliation process, provide assistance for projects including the construction of low-cost housing and boost imports of Afghan agricultural projects.

China has been seeking support from friendly nations for its bilateral approach to settling South China Sea territorial disputes, largely to counter efforts by the US, Philippines and others to challenge China's claim to virtually the entire sea and creation of new islands out of coral reefs. Russia has so far been the most prominent nation to publicly endorse China's position.

China has refused to participate in international arbitration on the matter brought by the Philippines and undermined efforts to approach the issue multilaterally through the 10-member Association of Southeast Asian Nations.

Hou said Abdullah pledged Afghanistan's

S KOREA, US, JAPAN PLAN JOINT DRILLS ON N KOREAN THREAT

SEOUL: South Korea, the United States and Japan will hold their first joint military training next month focused on cooperating to detect signs of missile launches from North Korea and trace missile trajectories, a Seoul defense official said yesterday.

The drills, set for around June 28, will be held on the sidelines of biennial multinational naval exercises scheduled for waters off Hawaii from June to August, which the three countries regularly attend, the official said. The official spoke on condition of anonymity, citing department rules.

The trilateral drills will involve Aegisequipped ships from the three countries, but they will not involve missile-interception training, the official said. The three countries have held joint search-and-rescue drills in the past. The training follows a 2014 intelligence-gathering pact among the three countries, designed to better cope with North Korea's increasing nuclear and missile threats. It was the first such agreement among the three countries. An international standoff over North Korea has recently deepened after Pyongyang carried out its fourth nuclear test in January and a long-range rocket launch in February.

Washington regularly holds military drills with South Korea and Japan - which together host about 80,000 American troops - and shares intelligence with them on a bilateral level. But Seoul and Tokyo don't, largely a result of lingering public resentments in South Korea against Japan over its 1910-1945 colonial rule of the Korean Peninsula.

The Korean Peninsula was divided into a US-backed South Korea and a Soviet-supported, socialist North Korea at the end of the Japanese occupation. The two Koreas fought a devastating three-year war in the early 1950s that ended with an armistice, not a peace treaty. — AP

MALAYSIA ACCUSED OF RIGHTS ABUSE FOR BARRING ACTIVIST'S TRIP

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia's government faced fresh allegations of trampling rights yesterday after the leader of a massive demonstration last year calling for the premier's ouster over a graft scandal said she was prevented going abroad to accept an award.

Maria Chin Abdullah, who heads the Coalition for Clean and Fair Elections Malaysia's leading political pressure group-said she was stopped Sunday night from travelling to South Korea to accept the Gwangju Prize for Human Rights on behalf of her group. "It's outrageous and shows a desperate government clutching on to power when it should be accountable," she told AFP.

Chin said she was given no explanation and that the refusal violated her constitutional rights. Prime Minister Najib Razak's government is accused of cracking down on civil liberties following a 2013 election setback and amid allegations that billions of dollars were stolen from a state development fund he founded called 1Malaysia Development Berhad (1MDB).

Najib and 1MDB both deny wrongdoing. Chin's organization-known in Malaysia as "Bersih", the Malay word for "clean"-is an alliance of NGOs that has staged large demonstrations in recent years to demand reform of an electoral system it says is rigged in favor of the ruling coalition. Last August it orchestrated protests by tens of thousands to press for Najib's ouster over the graft allegations and demand anti-corruption reforms. Chin's travel refusal drew criticism of the government on Malaysia's hyperactive social media Monday, and opposition leader Wan Azizah Wan Ismail vowed to call for a protest against "this shameful, desperate act".

In the past three years dozens of activists and government critics including Chin have been investigated on a range of charges, typically sedition, and authorities banned Bersih's yellow shirts as a "national security threat" following last August's anti-Najib protests.

Last year, opposition leader Anwar Ibrahim was jailed for five years on a sodomy conviction that the United States and others said raised troubling questions about Malaysia's judiciary and rule of law. An appeals court was to rule yesterday on the sedition conviction last year of prominent anti-government activist Hishamuddin Rais, who said in 2013 that Najib's government should be overthrown. Human Rights Watch on Monday called his conviction "a shameful, politically motivated attack" displaying a "yawning and rapidly expanding gap" between the government's conduct and international law. — AFP

AUSTRALIANS IN COURT CHARGED WITH PLOT TO TAKE BOAT TO SYRIA

BRISBANE: An Australian firebrand preacher deported from the Philippines and four other suspected jihadists appeared in a northern Australian court yesterday charged with planning to head for Syria in a 7-meter (23 -foot) boat to fight for the Islamic State group.

Philippine authorities said Robert Cerantonio, also known as Musa Cerantonio, was deported in 2014 because of his suspected links to terrorists based on YouTube videos allegedly showing him advocating jihad and

urging local Muslims to support militants in the Middle East.

Yesterday, the Cairns Magistrates Court ordered the extradition of Cerantonio and his four co-accused from Queensland state to their hometown of Melbourne to face a federal charge outlawing Australian foreign fighters. Entering or preparing to enter a foreign country to engage in hostile activity is a crime in Australia punishable by life imprisonment.

Cerantonio and co-accused Shayden

Thorne, Kadir Kaya, Antonio Grenata and Paul Dacre have not entered pleas. Police allege that the defendants, aged 21 to 33, towed a half-cabin fiberglass power boat with a car 3,100 kilometers (1,900 miles) from Melbourne to Laura in Australiaís tropical north before they were arrested last Tuesday.

Police say they planned to travel by boat through Indonesia to the Philippines. Police have not specified how they allegedly planned to get from the Philippines to Syria. All had their passports canceled to prevent them leaving the country to fight for extremist groups such as the Islamic State.

Philippine authorities said Cerantonio was deported in 2014 for being an jundocumented foreign nationalî after the Australian government canceled his passport. He was arrested two weeks earlier in the Philippinesí central Cebu provinceís Lapu-Lapu city but faced no formal charges. Philippine police alleged Cerantonio had called for jihad on YouTube and lectured Filipino Muslims to support the Islamic State group. Australian police said at the time that Cerantoniois social media postings were ioffensive and disturbing,î but did not violate Australiaís law.

Authorities allege Cerantonio bought the boat in the first suspected attempt by wouldbe foreign fighters to leave Australia by sea. Security officials estimate 110 Australians are fighting for the Islamic State group in the Middle East. — AP

KENYA POLICE BREAK UP OPPOSITION PROTESTS

NAIROBI: Kenyan police fired tear gas and beat opposition demonstrators with truncheons yesterday to stop them storming the offices of the electoral commission to demand its dissolution. Hundreds of protesters were prevented from reaching the offices of the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission (IEBC). Some of the demonstrators threw stones at police. There have been several such protests in recent weeks.

Protests were also held in other Kenyan towns, including Kisumu and Kisii in the southwest, with police there firing tear gas to break up the crowds, local media reported.

"Police are using unnecessary excessive force on peaceful demonstrators, they are not justified at all," said former prime minister Raila Odinga, promising to hold protests every Monday. Odinga, who lost his latest bid for the presidency in 2013, accuses the electoral commission of being biased towards President Uhuru Kenyatta. He has demanded that a new slate of commissioners be named ahead of the next election in August 2017.

The windscreen of Odinga's own car was damaged during yesterday's protest. He later said he was not inside the vehicle at the time. Inspector General of Police Joseph Boinet denied rumors that police had fired on the car. Police spokesman George Kinoti said only teargas had been used to disperse the protesters, stressing that "no live bullets were used". Kenyatta beat Odinga by more than 800,000 votes to win the presidency in 2013.

Odinga and civil society groups have accused the electoral commission of a series of irregularities that they said skewed the results. The election nonetheless passed off peacefully, in contrast to the country's disputed 2007 elections which degenerated into fierce interethnic violence that left more than 1,100 people dead after supporters of Odinga, who is from the Luo people, challenged his defeat by Mwai Kibaki, a Kikuyu. The next election in Aug 2017 is shaping up as a rematch of the 2013 election, with 71-year old Odinga expected to try to unseat Kenyatta, 54. President Kenyatta recently organized a meeting with several party faithful to discuss the possibility of reorganizing the electoral commission. — AFP

The model crackdown is just the latest move by authorities to control online expression in Iran. 
In May 2014, authorities arrested a group of young Iranian men and women for an online video of them dancing to Pharrell Williams' song "Happy." While the arrests drew widespread criticism, including from the musician himself, those involved each received suspended sentences of six months' imprisonment and 91 lashes. Meanwhile, journalists, filmmakers, writers and activists also have been detained, sentenced or imprisoned. Yesterday, Iran's semi-official ISNA news agency reported authorities arrested Mahdi Boutorabi, the manager of an Iranian blogging service called persianblog.ir. The ISNA report did not elaborate on the case of Boutorabi, who previously was arrested following Iran's disputed 2009 presidential election. — Agencies

LEICESTER CHANGE LANDSCAPE AS TV CASH FLOOD LOOMS

The Premier League season's defining quirk was that with a vast tide of television money set to flood England's top flight, Leicester City's triumph showed that wealth isn't everything. While Manchester City and Manchester United's squads cost a combined estimated total of £800 million (\$1.16 billion), Leicester's title-winning squad barely exceeded the £50 million mark. In the context of the £5.14 billion television deal due to kick in next season, their fairytale 5,000-1 success suggested that it is no longer about how much money you spend, but how you spend it.


"I've grown up always believing the big clubs, with the most money, win," said Jamie Redknapp, the Liverpool midfielder turned TV pundit. "Even Blackburn, when they won the title (in 1995), spent a lot of money and had the best players. This is like no other." While the feats of Jamie Vardy (£1 million), Riyad Mahrez (£400,000) and N'Golo Kante (£5.6 million) demonstrated a new way of spending, Leicester's football revealed a different way of winning.

In an age when many teams continue to worship at the altar of 'tiki-taka', Claudio Ranieri's well-drilled, hard-running side averaged 44.8 percent of possession - the third-lowest in the league - and had a pass completion rate of 70.5 percent - the league's second-lowest. With Tottenham Hotspur, another high-intensity team, challenging for the title under the inspirational Mauricio Pochettino, Football Association chairman Greg Dyke was moved to exclaim: "The old order has broken."

Man Utd Stagnate

The Professional Footballers' Association Team of the Year told its own story, with Leicester and Tottenham contributing four players each. Excepting Harry Kane, the division's 25-goal top scorer, who came through Tottenham's youth system, all were signed for fees dwarfed by the £49 million that City spent on Raheem Sterling. West Ham United's Dimitri Payet, another Team of the Year inclusion, was a relative snip at £10.7 million.

WHITE MALE BRAZIL CABINET RAISES FEARS

To the people who benefited most from the long, recently truncated rule of Brazil's leftist Workers Party, the look of the successor government could not be more disheartening. Whereas cabinet posts over the past 13 years were often filled by women and blacks, new Interim President Michel Temer last week presented a group of 23 ministers that looked a lot like him - white, male and mostly old. "I am not represented," says Bruno Leao, a 24-year-old business student in Rio de Janeiro, who is part of a generation of black Brazilians who earned unprecedented access to education and other socioeconomic gains because of Workers Party policies. "All those years of struggle and it's like it didn't happen," he adds, noting that advances in civil rights, education and purchasing power remain tenuous.

Temer, a 75-year-old centrist and constitutional scholar, took over the presidency after the Senate forced the suspension of Dilma Rousseff, Brazil's first woman leader, by voting on Thursday to put her on trial for breaking budget laws. Most Brazilians backed Rousseff's impeachment but in one of the world's biggest racial and cultural melting pots, where more than half the 200 million people identify themselves as black or mixed, the makeup of Temer's government raised alarm. Leftists, minorities and many lower-income Brazilians fear that a deep economic recession, and the spending cuts that the new government says are essential to spur a recovery, could mean rolling back progressive policies. "The rallying cry right now is the economy and that can become an excuse to scrap anything related to matters of inclusion, equality or culture," says Esther Solano, a sociologist at the Federal University of Sao Paulo. She points to one of the first decisions by Temer: To fold a ministry of women, racial equality and human rights into the far-bigger ministry of justice, led by a man.

left in Brazil. The Workers Party had managed for the best part of a decade to combine economic growth and fiscal responsibility with social programs that attacked poverty and promoted diversity. But its support frayed under Rousseff as the economy fell into recession and huge corruption scandals rocked the country. In his first term, former President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, the party's icon and Rousseff's mentor, included Marina Silva, a black environmentalist who toiled as a rubber tapper in her teens, and Gilberto Gil, an internationally acclaimed black songwriter. Rousseff had so many women ministers and aides that male operatives in Brasìlia scoffed at the number of pantsuits.

Old Status Quo

While Brazil's constitution enshrines social benefits similar to those in Western Europe, Temer has already said pension and social security laws are the very first that need to be streamlined. He also plans labor reforms, a set of priorities that have some Brazilians worried the new government has no interest in the poor. "It won't be hard to return to the old, exclusionary status quo when you don't even consider inclusion in the new government," says Djamila Ribeiro, a black philosopher and columnist for Carta Capital, a leftist magazine. A commodities-fueled boom helped the Workers Party lift more than 30 million people from poverty before Brazil's economy ground to a halt. Policies like affirmative action programs and broader scholarship opportunities, which increased enrollment at universities from around 2 percent of the young black population in 2003 to about 10 percent in 2013, created new opportunities for many once marginalized. Yet Brazil remains one of the most unequal societies in the world. Among those who escaped poverty during the boom, most from racially mixed backgrounds, some still earn little more than \$6 a day and are at risk of sliding back. The popularity of social programs is one reason leftist candidates continue to outpoll conservatives in forecasts for 2018 presidential elections.

In an April survey by polling institute Datafolha, Lula and Silva, the former environment minister who now leads her own party, tied for the lead with about 20 percent support each. Temer, who has said he will not run, only got 2 percent of those polled. In his first address as interim president, Temer promised to pursue business-friendly policies but keep the programs that were Workers Party hallmarks, like income assistance for poor families who keep their kids in school.

Aides say the new Cabinet was selected quickly from the ranks of parties who would support the new government. "We tried to look for women," said Eliseu Padilha, Temer's new chief of staff, "but it wasn't possible." Some of the new government's allies and supporters say the hand wringing overlooks the need for swift economic measures. "At the moment, more urgent than a grand discussion about the sex and color of ministers, is knowing whether the ministers have the capacity to succeed," wrote Mansueto Almeida, a well-known economist, in a widely read blog post.

enth place, with Ronald Koeman's Southampton, fellow canny spenders, provisionally fifth ahead of Manchester United's postponed final game against Bournemouth, which fell victim to a bomb scare. The big clubs met with failure of varying stripes. Worn down by Mourinho, the defending champions collapsed completely, but Guus Hiddink steadied the ship and with Italy coach Antonio Conte arriving after Euro 2016, a new future is taking shape.

'Wake-Up Call'

There is immense anticipation, meanwhile, at City, where Pep Guardiola will replace Manuel Pellegrini following a season of damaging inconsistency that nonetheless yielded the League Cup and a first Champions League semi-final appearance. Liverpool have already been revitalized by a new manager and despite an eighth-place finish, the club's engrossing run to the Europa League final has hinted at the thrills that may lie ahead under Jurgen Klopp. At Arsenal, Arsene Wenger soldiers on towards the 20th anniversary of his appointment.

He has, customarily, delivered another season of Champions League football the 19th in succession - but with Arsenal having spectacularly failed to exploit their rivals' struggles, fan dissent towards the Frenchman has been louder than ever. Emboldened by their TV gains, the heavyweights can be expected to flex their muscles in the closeseason transfer window and former Leicester manager Martin O'Neill believes that they will all come back stronger. "Maybe it's a wake-up call," he said. "I think the big teams might feel it was one year they slipped up in and they might become very strong again. Money talks in this business."

Still, critics say the cabinet also includes politicians whose past actions and discourse are at odds with the very ministries they will command. The new agriculture minister, a wealthy soy grower who has long clashed with environmentalists because of the crop's encroachment on Amazon rainforest, is charged with regulating farming. The education minister hails from a party that sued at the Supreme Court to try to block affirmative action. The shift risks backfiring, especially if it helps rally disillusioned leftists who fragmented because of corruption scandals and policy missteps that weakened the Workers Party. "It would be an error for the new government to think that they are somehow representative of Brazil," says Renato Meirelles, founder of Data Popular, a research firm that specializes in the economics and behavior of Brazil's working class. "This is a placeholder government that doesn't have anything close to a broad popular mandate." — Reuters

GOP'S TRUMP SOUNDS LIKE A DEMOCRAT

s he tries to charm Republicans still skeptical of his presidential candidacy, Donald Trump has a challenge: On several key issues, he sounds an awful lot like a Democrat. And on some points of policy, such as trade and national defense, the billionaire businessman could even find himself running to the left of Hillary Clinton, his likely Democratic rival in the general election. Trump is a classic Republican in many ways. He rails against environmental and corporate regulations, proposes dramatically lower tax rates and holds firm on opposing abortion rights. But the presumptive GOP nominee doesn't fit neatly into a traditional ideological box.

"I think I'm running on common sense," he said in a recent interview with AP."I think I'm running on what's right. I don't think in terms of labels." Perhaps Trump's clearest break with Republican orthodoxy is on trade, which the party's 2012 platform said was "crucial for our economy" and a path to "more American jobs, higher wages, and a better standard of living."

Trump says his views on trade are "not really different" from the rest of his party's, yet he pledges to rip up existing deals negotiated by "stupid leaders" who failed to put American workers first. He regularly slams the North American Free Trade Agreement involving the US, Mexico and Canada, and opposes a pending Asia-Pacific pact, positions shared by Democratic candidate Bernie Sanders. "The problem is the ideologues, the very conservative group, would say everything has to be totally free trade,"Trump said. "But you can't have free trade if the deals are going to be bad. And that's what we have." Trump long has maintained that he has no plans to scale back Social Security benefits or raise its qualifying retirement age. The position puts him in line with Clinton. She has said she would "defend and expand" Social Security, has ruled out a higher retirement age and opposes reductions in cost-of-living adjustments or other benefits. "There is tremendous waste, fraud and abuse, but I'm leaving it the way it is," Trump recently told Fox Business Network.

It's a stance at odds with the country's top-ranked elected Republican, House Speaker Paul Ryan

of Wisconsin, who has advocated fundamental changes to Social Security and other entitlement programs. But it's also one that Trump argues

> keeps him in line with the wishes of most voters.

"Remember the wheelchair being pushed over the cliff when you had Ryan chosen as your vice president?" Trump told South Carolina voters this year, referring to then-vice presidential candidate Ryan's budget plan. "That was the end of that campaign." Ryan was Mitt Romney's running mate in 2012.

Complicating the efforts to define Trump is his penchant for offering contradictory ideas about policy. He also has taken recently to saying that all of his plans are merely suggestions, open to later negotiation. Trump's tax plan, for instance, released last fall, called for lowering the rate paid by the wealthiest people in the United States from 39.6 percent to 25 percent and slashing the corporate tax rate from 35 percent to 15 percent.

> Trump described it as a massive boon for the middle class. Outside experts concluded it disproportion

ately benefited the rich and would balloon the federal deficit. Close to clinching the nomination, Trump now appears to be pulling away from his own proposal. While he still wants to lower taxes for the wealthy and businesses, he now says his plan was just a starting point for discussions and he would like to see the middle class benefit more from whatever changes he seeks in tax law. "We have to go to Congress, we have to go to the Senate, we have to go to our congressmen and women and we have to negotiate a deal," Trump said recently. "So it really is a proposal, but it's a very steep proposal."

Trump has a similar take on the minimum wage. Trump said at a GOP primary debate that wages are too high, and later made clear that he does not support a federal minimum wage. Yet when speaking about the issue, he says he recognizes the difficulty of surviving on the current minimum wage of \$7.25 an hour. "I am open to doing something with it," he told CNN this month. On foreign policy, Trump already appears working to paint Clinton as a national security hawk who would too easily the lead the country into conflict. "On foreign policy, Hillary is trigger happy,"Trump said at a recent rally, He listed the countries where the US had intervened militarily during her tenure as secretary of state and pointed to her vote to authorize the Iraq war while she was in the Senate. Trump's own "America First" approach appears to lean more toward isolationism. One of his foreign policy advisers, Walid Phares, recently described it as a "third way". "This doesn't fit any of the boxes," Phares said.

Clinton has advocated using "smart power," a combination of diplomatic, legal, economic, political and cultural tools to expand American influence. She believes the US has a unique ability to rally the world to defeat international threats. She argues the country must be an active participant on the world stage, particularly as part of international alliances such as NATO. Trump has criticized the military alliance, questioning a structure that sees the US pay for most of its costs. "The best thing about Donald Trump today is he's not Hillary Clinton, but he's certainly not a conservative, either," said GOP Rep Tim Huelskamp, a member of the ultra-conservative Freedom Caucus and a Ted Cruz supporter in the 2016 race, in an interview with "Fox News Sunday".— AP

CHAMP WILDER OPEN TO FIGHTS WITH RIVALS

NEW YORK: Unbeaten heavyweight champion Deontay Wilder could be in line to face rival undefeated British ring kings Tyson Fury and Anthony Joshua after a planned bout next Saturday in Moscow was canceled. Lou DiBella, Wilder's promoter, said that any talk of rescheduling a new fight date for Wilder to meet Russian Alexander Povetkin, who tested positive for the banned substance meldonium, was "unfounded and premature." The World Boxing Council orderd the fight not be staged next week after the doping positive, DiBella saying Povetkin breached the fight contract and Wilder "will await further communications from the WBC and will weigh all our options given what has transpired." Those options could include WBC champion Wilder, 36-0 with 35 knockouts, working toward unifying the heavyweight crown by meeting either International Boxing Federation champion Joshua, 16-0 with 16 knockouts, or World Boxing Association and World Boxing Organization champion Fury, 25-0 with 18 knockouts. "This is a huge disappointment and a setback to my goals in boxing," Wilder said. — AFP

ARTETA TO RETIRE AFTER ENDING ARSENAL CAREER

LONDON: Spanish midfielder Mikel Arteta, whose contract with Arsenal is due to expire, has announced his intention to retire from playing and move into coaching. The 34-year-old said he was "99 percent" certain to hang up his boots after turning out for Arsenal for the last time in their 4-0 win over Aston Villa on the final day of the Premier League season on Sunday.

Arteta burst into tears when the full-time whistle was blown before explaining why. "It was unbelievable because the last few months have been really difficult and I have been through a difficult position as well with my role in the team," the Spaniard said. "To have the opportunity to say goodbye and 99 per cent to say goodbye to the sport that I love is very hard, but my taste of it can't get better than today. "A big thank you to everybody." Arteta, who joined Arsenal in 2011 following a successful spell with Everton, won two FA Cups and two Community Shields with Arsene Wenger's side and insists he knew it was time to call time on his playing days with the Gunners. "It is very hard to stop but I wanted to leave it... I wanted to decide and I thought for the last few months I wasn't good enough to represent this club on the pitch," he said. —AFP

JAYS FALL TO RANGERS AS SIMMERING FEUD BOILS OVER

ARLINGTON: A feud simmering since Jose Bautista's bat flip in last year's AL Division Series boiled over into a wild brawl in the final game of the season between Toronto and Texas, a 7-6 victory for the Rangers on Sunday. Bautista and Texas second baseman Rougned Odor got into a fistfight behind the bag after a hard slide by the Toronto slugger in the eighth inning. Players from both teams rushed the field as Odor landed a punch to Bautista's face.

Umpires needed about 10 minutes to restore order, and Blue Jays reliever Jesse Chavez (0-1) hit Prince Fielder with the next pitch when the game resumed. He was ejected after an earlier warning for both teams when Bautista was hit by a pitch from Matt Bush. Toronto manager John Gibbons was among eight ejections in the game. lan Desmond hit a three-run homer in the seventh to give Bush (1-0) his first major league win two days after the 30-year-old rookie made his major league debut.



ELLIOTT LEADS WAY AS BLUES BEAT SHARKS 2-1 IN GAME 1

ST LOUIS: Once again, Brian Elliott was verting on 33 percent of its power the star of the show. His latest performance gave his St Louis Blues teammates plenty of comfort knowing he had their back. "When your goalie is your best player, it gives you a great chance of winning, and that was the case," captain David Backes said after the Blues opened their first Western Conference final in 15 years with a tense 2-1 victory over the San Jose Sharks on Sunday night.

"It was that way for the first two rounds," Backes added, "and nothing's changed in Game 1 of the third round." Backes opened the scoring and Jori Lehtera had the go-ahead goal in the second period on a spinning shot that Martin Jones could not handle. "I just got the puck and closed my eyes and shot it, that's about it." Lehtera said. "Just keep it simple." Said Jones: "Not much to it, just found a hole. I'll make that save next time." Tomas Hertl scored on a first-period deflection for the Sharks, who outshot St Louis 32-23 but couldn't quite solve Elliott. Among those he frustrated was captain Joe Pavelski, who had seven shots and had perhaps the best chance in the third period on a one-timer near the midway mark. Pavelski and Elliott were roommates at Wisconsin. "I'm going to blame that one on the stick," Pavelski said. "No, I have to find a way to put that in regardless of what goes on. I thought it was going in."

plays in the postseason.

"They were hot in the last series," Blues defenseman Alex Pietrangelo said. "We stepped up to the challenge." The Blues made good on their first chance with home-ice advantage in the playoffs, although they're just 4-4 at the Scottrade Center heading into Game 2 on Tuesday night. Elliott was at his best - and got some luck in the second period when the Blues were outshot 16-5, but got the lone goal when Lehtera scored unassisted. The goalie benefited from a quick whistle with 1:14 left when he unsuccessfully tried to smother the puck on a long dump-in by Melker Karlsson, and it slowly slid between his pads and off his stick into the net, just after play had been ruled dead. "The puck was spinning a lot and it probably just spun out," Elliott said. "I haven't really seen it yet, so I don't know."

Backes opened the scoring with a deflection and is tied with sharpshooter Vladimir Tarasenko for the team lead with seven goals in the playoffs, mostly because he's fearless in front of the net waiting to pounce on rebounds. The team captain had 21 goals in the

DAY DOMINATES BEST FIELD IN TO WIN PLAYERS CHAMPIONSHIP

PONTE VEDRA BEACH: Jason Day had a crystal trophy at his side and a pacifier in his pocket. Only after he completed a wire-to-wire victory in The Players Championship did Day reveal that his 3-year-old son, Dash, had kept him up the night before with a stomach ailment. Exactly how the pacifier wound up in his pocket remained a mystery, though it was an illustration of his week at the TPC Sawgrass.

Nothing unsettled him. Nothing was going to stop him. "I've got no stress in my life," Day said after his four-shot victory, his seventh in the last 10 months. "Other than Dash waking up last night ... Dash woke up and he threw up everywhere. How funny is that? I've got this pacifier here because it's in my pocket for some reason. But like that's one thing that I'm sitting here (because) I was enjoying myself. I prepped well, had great work. I felt good about my swing. "Everything was coming along nicely."

For the rest of the PGA Tour, it must be frightening. Dating to the Canadian Open last summer, Day's seven victories include a major, The Players, a World Golf Championship and two FedEx Cup playoff events. He already had won twice this year. And yet when he arrived at the TPC Sawgrass, all he heard was that he has not played this golf course very well. His most recent round was an 81 last year to miss the cut. That now seems like a long time ago.

Flawless performance

Day started this tournament by tying the course record with a 9-under 63 and breaking the 36 hole tournament record at 15-under par. He survived the scariest day at Sawgrass when the greens were as slick as ice. He overcame some errant shots and a few doubts on the front nine Sunday. And then he finished with yet another flawless performance on the back nine, where he played bogey-free all four rounds.

One year after Rickie Fowler turned in the most dynamic finish in Players Championship history, Day made Sunday look inevitable. "I'm very motivated to win as much as I can right now," he said. Day never let anyone closer than two shots the entire final round, though there were a few anxious moments, especially when he muffed three chips from just 40 feet right of the green on the par-5 ninth. A potential birdie turned into an unsettling bogey, and he had to make a 6-foot putt to avoid the score being worse. And then, it was over.

Day rolled in a 15-foot birdie putt on No 10, another 15-foot birdie putt on No 12, and the 28-year-old Australian never came close to bogey the rest of the way. He closed with a 1under 71 to become the first wire-to-wire winner at The Players since Hal Sutton in 2000. That was the year Sutton finished off Tiger Woods by saying, "Be the right club today," with a 6-iron into the 18th to sew up the victory. Day needed nothing that dramatic. Kevin Chappell was 5 under over his last 10 holes to finish second, though he never was a serious threat to win. No one was.

Ridiculous short game

"It's no coincidence he's No 1 in the world," Justin Thomas said after closing with a Sundaybest 65 to tie for third. "He drives it extremely far, extremely straight. He hits it to the moon, so he can access pins that most people can't. His short game is ridiculous. I think I've pretty much covered it all there when it comes to the golf."

Day finished at 15-under 273 for his 10th career victory on the PGA Tour. Only Rory McIlroy with 11 has more victories among players still in their 20s. Day is the third No 1 player to win The Players Championship, joining Greg Norman (1994) and Tiger Woods (2001 and 2013). Perhaps even more telling about the state of his game is that he joined Woods, Tom Watson and Johnny Miller as the only players since 1970 to go wire-to-wire twice in the same season. Day led from start to finish at the Arnold Palmer Invitational at Bay Hill. Day also won the Dell Match Play, winning six of his seven matches before they reached the 18th green. Adam Scott referred to this run as "Tigeresque." "That's one of the hardest things to do when you are hot like that, to keep pushing," Scott said. "But he has a very strong desire to achieve so much, and I think probably his goals are changing throughout this period, and he's expecting more and more of himself. He's got that ability to push himself and accomplish." — AP

TOYOTA GAZOO STARTS 2016 FIA WORLD ENDURANCE CHAMPIONSHIP WITH PODIUM FINISH

SILVERSTONE: Toyota GAZOO Racing started the 2016 FIA World Endurance Championship (WEC) with an encouraging podium finish in the 6 Hours of Silverstone after an eventful race. Stephane Sarrazin, Mike Conway and Kamui Kobayashi finished third to extend Toyota's run of podiums at Silverstone which stretches back to its first WEC season in 2012.

Mike's third podium in WEC meant he earned the Richard Lloyd Trophy, presented to the highest placed member of the British Racing Drivers' Club in the 6 Hours of Silverstone. Kamui marked his hybrid debut and his first race at the wheel of a Toyota since the 2009 Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, with a strong performance on his way to the podium. The

#5 of Anthony Davidson, Sebastien Buemi and Kazuki Nakajima had also been on course for a strong result until a puncture severely damaged the rear of the car. It finished 16th. By virtue of being the only hybrid manufacturer to get both cars to the chequered flag, Toyota leads the World Championship after the first of nine rounds.

According to Takayuki Yoshitsugu, Chief Representative, Middle East and North Africa Representative Office, ToyotaMotor Corporation, "It was a great performance by the team to earn a podium finish at Silverstone and marks a promising beginning for the TS050 Hybrid with its new 2.4-litre turbocharged engine and 8MJ hybrid system. As

always, Toyota will use the experience gained on the track and leverage it with its manufacturing of road cars to create ever better vehicles that exceed our customer expectations. I would like to thank our fans for their encouragement and we look forward to their support of our racing initiatives in 2016."

On this occasion, Toshio Sato, Team President, said, "This has been an exciting and eventful first race of the season. We take encouragement from this result, especially after our difficulties in qualifying. To achieve a two-car finish with a completely new car is a good accomplishment. We are not at the level we want yet, but we have made a big improvement compared to last year. It was

great to see the #6 car setting very competitive lap times later in the race; this shows we have good potential in the TS050 Hybrid. We will continue to push hard to improve for the next race."

On a sunny day, the TS050 Hybrid made a solid race debut, illustrating its potential by setting a fastest lap just 0.354seconds behind the overall quickest. In the early part of the race, the two TS050 Hybrids ran close together after starting fifth and sixth, as Sebastien in the #5 found his way past Mike in the other car. At half distance, the #5 was third but encountered trouble of its own with a right rear puncture. Unluckily, the puncture occurred just after pit entry, meaning Kazuki completed a full 5.901-km lap at slow speed whilst the damaged tyre ripped off significant amounts of rear bodywork. Intense work from the mechanics got the car back on track after 41 minutes of repairs, with Sebastien resuming in 29th, 24 laps behind. The #5 crew fought hard to regain ground in the search for World Championship points, while the sister car showed promising speed and matched the leaders' lap times in the closing stints. The #6 car took the chequered flag in front of 52,000 fans (weekend total). Toyota GAZOO Racing is in action again next month at the 6 Hours of Spa-Francorchamps in Belgium on 7 May, a race which takes place just 120km away from the team's home base in Cologne, Germany.



'NATIONAL TREASURE' COVENTRY AIMING FOR OLYMPIC RECORD

CAPE TOWN: Kirsty Coventry could become the first female Olympian to win eight individual medals when she competes at the 2016 Games this summer, but recent doping scandals have made the Zimbabwe swimmer wonder if her races in Rio will be clean. The 32-year-old, an athletes representative for the International Olympic Committee and World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), won gold, silver and bronze medals in 2004 and added a gold and three silvers in Beijing four years later. After making her Olympic debut as a 16-year-old in Sydney, Coventry will be competing in her fifth successive Olympics in Rio after coming away empty-handed in London. With world sport battling to overcome a series of doping scandals, Coventry said she was stunned when she learned about the extent of cheating going on.

"I used to say 'I know my sport is clean' but all the recent revelations from China and Russia make me unsure that the swimmer in the lane next to me is clean," she told Reuters in an interview. "It makes me really sad, I had no idea about this level of doping in the past. I guess dopers are good at covering up and hiding. "But all the revelations are good and it's a very interesting time for sport and I'm proud to be part of the fight against doping."

While Coventry says she is now driven by the chance to win that eighth Olympic medal, she did not realize she was on the brink of a record until competing in London four years ago. "I didn't know that until a reporter told me in at the London Games," she said. "I think that's kind of cool and being competitive, I like to set goals. "And that is now a massive goal to try and get back on the podium, regardless of gold, silver or bronze."

Tougher training

Coventry, who shares the record of seven individual medals with Hungarian swimmer Krisztina Egerszegi, is focused on the 200 meters backstroke in Rio, though she has also qualified for the 100m backstroke and 200m individual medley. She said she might not compete in all three races and would firm up her plans closer to the time. "I'll make that decision closer to Rio but I'll do a minimum of two," she said. "The 200 back is my baby, I so like racing that one, but I might just do all three.

"London should have been my last Olympics if things had gone differently and I'd not dislocated my knee four months before. "Then I got pneumonia two months before and at that point I knew I wasn't going to end my career the way I would want to. "I had a definite goal to win a medal in London and after I made a decision that I wanted to end my career in the best condition possible and having left everything in that pool, regardless of the result." Training has become tougher, Coventry confessed, but her love for swimming may see her push on after Rio. "When I made the decision to carry on swimming after London, Rio was to be the last one, and now that I'm fit and back to being in good shape and having consistency in my training, I'm thinking maybe I'll keep going for a year afterwards.

"You've got to allow more time for recovery, it's a priority," she added. "I don't like doing nothing but I've realized I can't keep hammering away every day and then I'm not getting any efficiency out of my practices. "I've had to make adjustment and it has been a bit of a learning curve."

One of her training partners in Charlotte, North Carolina is 11-times Olympic medalist Ryan Lochte, who at 31 is facing many of the same training issues as Coventry. "We are going through the same things and can share a lot and so it's been a very good experience," added Coventry, who is seen as a bridge in the racial divide back home and has been called a 'national treasure'. "When you've been an elite athlete for a length of time, you always find reasons and things that keep you motivated and for me it's my love of the sport and seeing the positive impact it has on the community in Zimbabwe." — Reuters

BECKHAM EFFECT BEHIND HK's 1st lady of football

HONG KONG: Hong Kong trailblazer Chan Yuenting became the first woman coach to take a men's football team to a top-flight title thanks to the toughness that earned her the nickname "beefball" and a teenage crush on David Beckham. Chan, 27, led Eastern Sports Club to win Hong Kong's Premier League in April for the first time in 21 years.

It was Chan's debut season as head coach and earned her a Guinness World Record as the first woman coach ever to win a men's championship title in a top national football league. Her path into the game started as a 13-year-old, when she became glued to watching Manchester United games on TV and, in particular, their England legend Beckham, whom she swooned over as "handsome".

The crush soon developed into a love of the game itself and propelled her into a football coaching career, despite opposition from her parents. "I think no matter your age or your gender, what you need is hard work," Chan told AFP. "You are nothing if your team is doing badly. "On the pitch I forget my gender as a woman. I just hope to show my abilities."

After playing amateur football for university teams and representing Hong Kong, Chan decided to take the coaching track so she could break into the men's professional game. She went from assistant coach to head coach at Eastern in December after her predecessor accepted an offer from a club in mainland China.

Since then, she has set out to win the players' respect, spending hours dissecting match videos and statistics to demonstrate her deep knowledge of the game. "If I show them videos and data I can convince them what I think is correct," says Chan. "You have to trust science. It is leading modern football."

At a training session in Hong Kong, eagleeyed Chan, dressed in a black tracksuit, takes her place in the centre of team passing drills and quietly watches, sometimes running alongside the players. "I keep listening to them and like communicating with them," she says.

Rebel teen

If Chan had listened to her parents, she would not be where she is now. Worried she would have no future in football, they tried to persuade her to take up art or dancing instead.

But, determined to pursue her Beckhaminspired career, she faked her mother's signature as a teenager to apply for a football training program. "I felt football was exciting, then I started playing," says Chan. She studied geography at university, graduating in 2010, and went on to work as a data analyst at Hong Kong team Pegasus, where she was later assistant coach. "My family asked me to leave football as they think the salary is not high and the future is not stable. But I didn't listen to them... I'm tough," Chan says. Her never-say-die personality led her friends to give her the nickname "beefball". It plays on her name "yuen" which sounds like the Cantonese word for ball. The "beef" was added to reflect her resilience.

As well as winning more titles with Eastern, she now hopes to gain experience overseas with top clubs and bring it back to Hong Kong. The men's national team stands at a lowly 155th in the world rankings and there are limited football facilities in the densely populated southern Chinese finance hub. Many teams do not have a home ground. Eastern train on a rugby pitch. "We don't have our own training centres... we do our best within limited resources," says Chan.

Despite difficulties, she says she is satisfied with her coaching role, which she works fulltime. "Even if I don't succeed, I'm enjoying my life because I have a career that comes from my hobby." And she still harbours a childhood dream to meet Beckham one day. "I have to say thanks to him," she adds.

MURRAY A MAJOR FRENCH OPEN THREAT: DJOKOVIC

ROME: Novak Djokovic underlined the growing clay-court threat of Andy Murray barely a fortnight from the French Open after conceding defeat to the British number one in the final of the Rome Masters. Murray, the number two seed who suffered defeat to Djokovic in last week's Masters final in Madrid, celebrated his 29th birthday in style with a stylish 6-3, 6-3 victory over the Serbian in one hour, 35 minutes.

It was Murray's first title in Rome, the third clay-court title of his career after victories on the red dirt in Munich and Madrid last year and, more importantly, comes in timely fashion. Murray's powerful serve had Djokovic in trouble on more than one occasion during a rain-nit inr 35mins final in which he requested, without success, a break amid fears he would slip and injure his ankle. But Murray showed progress in other areas, and although Djokovic heads to Paris looking to make amends for last year's stunning defeat to Swiss Stan Wawrinka, Murray has just become a potentially bigger obstacle to his hopes of a 12th Grand Slam title. "I think he's using the court better now. He has more variety in his shots from the baseline play, so obviously he did improve," said Djokovic. "Winning Madrid and Rome and, you know, a couple of claycourt tournaments the last couple of years proves it. "At the French Open, the conditions are also a bit quicker, which he likes. He's been consistently playing well (at Roland Garros) throughout the years, and I'm sure he's going to be very motivated to do well again. "He's going to come in great form to Paris."

career". "The last thing I looked at today before I went on the court was a picture of my daughter," said Murray.

A week after his Madrid defeat, the stars aligned for the Scot thanks to Djokovic coming in fatigued after his late semi-final against Japan's Kei Nishikori on Saturday. But Murray stressed: "Every time I go up against him I know I have to play great tennis to win. Any time you beat the best player in the world, it's a big win."

In Paris, nine-time French Open champion Rafael Nadal and Swiss pair Wawrinka and Roger Federer will be out to make amends for early exits in Rome. Seventime Rome champion Nadal was ousted in the quarters by Djokovic, but two days after Djokovic called beating the Spaniard on clay "the ultimate challenge", Nadal gave little indication he fears for his prospects in Paris.

Murray's 'new outlook'

Becoming the first Briton to win in Rome since Patrick Hughes in 1931, it is the first time Murray's name has been added to a trophy since the birth of his baby daughter. He said the arrival of his daughter has changed his outlook on life and it will ultimately "have a positive effect on my tennis "I think I am playing well during the whole clay court season," Nadal said after his defeat on Friday. "And today I was there mentally, fighting for every point, hitting good shots." Wawrinka, beaten by Juan Monaco in the third round, is set to play in Geneva this week as he struggles for match-winning confidence ahead of the defense of his title in Paris.

There are even bigger doubts on Federer, who won the Roland Garros title just once in 2009, and exited Rome still complaining of a back injury which forced him out in Madrid. Serena Williams, meanwhile, heads to Paris brimming with confidence ahead of her bid for a third title at Roland Garros that wold take her Grand Slam tally to 22. The American swept past 21-year-old compatriot Madison Keys 7-6 (7/5), 6-3 to claim her fourth Italian Open victory on Sunday, first title of the season and 70th of her career. Williams becomes just the fifth woman to achieve such a total in singles after Martina Navratilova, Chris Evert, Steffi Graf and Margaret Court. "I'm going to definitely go in there and I feel more calm and I don't feel stress to, like, have to win," she said. —AFP

AUSSIE ATHLETES TO RECEIVE CONDOMS TO COMBAT ZIKA

SYDNEY: Australian athletes at the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro will be supplied with condoms which manufacturers say will offer "near complete" antiviral protection against the Zika virus. The Australian Olympic Committee announced the health measure for the Aug 5-21 Olympics in a statement yesterday, with the team's chef de mission Kitty Chiller saying distribution of the condoms was "a commonsense approach to a very serious problem we are facing in Rio."

The mosquito-borne Zika virus is an epidemic in Central and Latin America, and the World Health Organization has declared it a global health emergency. Zika causes mild illness or no symptoms in most people but is believed to be linked to a birth defect that causes babies to be born with unusually small heads.

Australian Stock Exchange-listed Starpharma Holdings and Ansell combined to produce the Dual Protect condoms, which provide protection via the physical barrier and a lubricant that contains an antiviral agent that counteracts viruses that cause sexually transmitted infections.

Starpharma said in a statement its lubricant showed near-complete antiviral protection against Zika in laboratory studies. Other countries are taking precautions ahead of the games including the United States, which sends the biggest delegation to the Olympics. The US Olympic Committee has formed a group that will establish best practice and information for athletes and officials traveling to Brazil.

Capt Martin S Cetron from the Centers for Disease Control, is on the panel. The CDC's most recent advice was for pregnant women to consider not going to the Olympics and for their male sexual partners to use condoms after the trip or abstain from sex during the pregnancy. The CDC also recommends that all travelers use insect repellent while in outbreak areas and continue to use it for three weeks after travel in case they might be infected but not feel sick. — AP

RUGBY STAR HAYNE LEAVES NFL, AIMS FOR OLYMPICS

SAN FRANCISCO: Australian rugby league star Jarryd Hayne's NFL experiment is over, as he announced his retirement Sunday from the San Francisco 49ers in order to push for selection in the Fiji Rugby Sevens team for the Rio Olympics. "I simply could not pass that chance up," Hayne said. "The Olympics has been something I have admired since I was a little boy, and it is an opportunity I feel very similar to me joining the NFL."

A 6-foot-2, 220-pound running back and special teams player, the 28-year-old Hayne was a surprise to make the initial 53-man roster out of training camp as a rookie last year with San Francisco. Playing eight games with one start for the 5-11 Niners, he had 17 carries for 52 yards and six catches for 27 yards while also returning eight punts for 76 yards.

"The support and understanding from the 49ers organization was unbelievable when I let them know about my decision to pursue another dream," Hayne said. "The past 12 months with the San Francisco 49ers have been absolutely incredible. I could not have predicted how far I have come as an NFL player. To not only be able to play in a game, but also say that I started a game in the NFL is something that I will remember for a lifetime."

He joined San Francisco as an undrafted free agent on March 3, 2015, then made the cut under former coach Jim Tomsula - making good on his goal nearly a year after leaving his old sport to chase a new NFL dream across the world. His journey captivated his home country nearly 7,000 miles away, with Australian media closely following his quest. He left the National Rugby League in 2014, then signed a three-year contract with San Francisco the next March in a deal he said included \$100,000 in guaranteed money. Hayne spent the previous nine years - from 2006-14 - with the Parramatta Eels in the NRL and also represented Australia and played for New South Wales state in the annual State-of-Origin series. His role might have been unclear under a new coaching regime after Chip Kelly was hired in January.

"Jarryd is a tremendous example of what can happen when you commit to a goal and do everything in your power to make it a reality," 49ers general manager Trent Baalke said. "He earned the right to wear a 49ers uniform and compete alongside the best in the game. We fully support Jarryd's decision to pursue another dream - representing the Fiji Rugby Sevens team in this summer's Olympic games. We look forward to watching him in Rio and wish him continued success."

No guarantees

Hayne has a Fijian father, and there was speculation when he quit rugby league that he'd switch to rugby union in a bid to qualify for Fiji's Olympic Sevens team. Fiji sevens coach Ben Ryan said Hayne would join the squad in London on Monday ahead of the last round of the World Sevens Series next weekend. Fiji leads the series. Ryan will trim his squad of 14 players, including Hayne, to 12 for the tournament at Twickenham and as a precursor to its final Olympic selection.—AP

'Demi-God' Dzsudzsak shakes Hungary out of soccer slumber

words that inspired Hungary to a playoff win and a place in a major tournament for the first time in three decades. "We might never have this chance again, noone's going to stop us qualifying! Not Norway, not even the best team in the world!" Dzsudzsak (pronounced 'Joo-jak') shouted at his team in the dressing room in Budapest last November.

A little over 90 minutes later Hungary had beaten Norway 2-1 to qualify for their first European Championships since 1972. "Our hair was standing on end, Dzsudzsak was like some kind of demi-God, a real leader," said a backroom staff member who witnessed the pre-match speech. After the whistle, the

BUDAPEST: Balazs Dzsudzsak roared the 29-year-old, who was not even born the last time Hungary made it to a major tournament (the 1986 World Cup), led fans in an emotional singing of the national anthem.

Magyar Talisman

Tears streaming from his eyes, the long-awaited qualification had been a cathartic moment for the blond winger and the nation. For almost a decade Dzsudzsak has been Hungary's talisman, its most valuable player, and the nearest the Magyars have come since the 1980s to producing a star.

A baby-faced village boy from remote eastern Hungary, his breakthrough year was 2007. Dzsudzsak's speed, pinpoint crossing and goalscoring threat, particularly from dead-balls, made him a key figure for Debreceni VSC in the third season of a three-in-row title winning run.

A scout from Dutch giants PSV Eindhoven had noticed, and Dzsudzsak made his Eredivisie debut in 2008, delighting success-starved Magyar fans who watched his games broadcast live on Hungarian TV. Top scorer for PSV in the 2010 and 2011 seasons, their fans loved the way he tormented arch rivals Ajax: he nicked five goals and three goal passes against the Amsterdam side in seven games.

After 55 goals in three and a half seasons in Holland, Dzsudzsak was drawing comparisons with Dutch legend Arjen Robben, and the attention of clubs including Juventus, Liverpool and Villareal. Aged 24, he seemed poised for a leap into the big time, but dismayed fans back home yearning to see a Hungarian at the very top when he opted for a move to the ambitious and cashrich Russian Premier League side Anzhi Makhachkala

"It's true I didn't go to a top club as many were expecting of me," Dzsudzsak said. "But this club has a bright future, within four years it will be doing well in the Champions League". It was not to be. After an injury-plagued spell and just eight appearances for Anzhi, Dzsudzsak was sold to Dynamo Moscow in 2012, but scored just 19 goals in three years. Let go this season to Bursaspor in Turkey, the Hungarian's form has been patchy, leading to periods on the bench, and some fans complaining about his work ethic. In contrast to the waning of his club career, his performances for the national team have improved with age. Accused in the past of under-performing for the national team, he was handed the captain's armband in 2014, and rescued a floundering Magyar Euro 2016 qualification campaign with a free-kick equalizer to win a point against bitter foes Romania in Bucharest. In France, Hungary are rank outsiders, but their opponents will surely have Dzsudzsak top of the list of Hungarian dangermen. — AFP

ALL-ROUND ALABA HELPS AUSTRIANS TAKE FLIGHT

VIENNA: Born to a Nigerian father and a Filipino mother, David Alaba is an unlikely poster boy for an Austrian national team soaring unprecedented heights. Raised in Vienna, Alaba left his hometown just after turning 16 to join Bayern Munich's youth academy.

As a youngster he idolised Patrick Vieira and dreamed of playing for Arsenal, but Bayern's persistence lured him to Germany where Alaba has blossomed into a worldclass talent. Pep Guardiola has tipped him to become "a future all-time best in the club's history." Quick, versatile and deadly from set-pieces, he is also the undisputed star of an Austrian side that had until recently spent years languishing in the international wilderness.

Alaba started his career as a midfielder but was converted to left-back by Louis van Gaal during his time as Bayern boss in 2010. He has also demonstrated his worth as a makeshift centre-back under Guardiola. "He's just incredible, he's just...wow. He can play absolutely everywhere," purred Guardiola, who will take over at Manchester City next season and is expected to make a push to bring Alaba, who only recently extended his Bayern contract until 2021, to the Premier League alongside him.

The Austrian was quick to return the compliment, praising Guardiola for his progression. "He pushes everybody, every day, in a good way. Especially me. I've been getting better with every year he's been here (at Bayern), because of him. "It's like he reinvented football. He thinks about football 24 hours a day."

Impressive list of honors

A precocious talent, Alaba was also eligible to represent Nigeria, the Philippines and Germany but was thrust into the Austrian national team aged just 17 years and 112 days to become the youngest player to represent the country. He again sent records tumbling when he made his Bayern debut a few months later, laying on an assist for Franck Ribery with his first touch in a 6-2 victory German Cup victory over Greuther Fuerth.

He scooped the Austrian footballer of the year award in 2011 as the youngestever recipient of the prize and has gone on to win the award five straight years, with former Bayern manager Ottmar Hitzfeld describing Alaba "as a gift from the heavens". Recognition of his ability has stretched around Europe as well. Alaba was named to UEFA's Team of the Year in 2013, Bayern's historic treble-winning season, and 2014. Far from a prolific scorer at club level, Alaba has proven much more of a threat for his country with 11 goals in 44 appearances, including four during Austria's impressive Euro 2016 campaign in which they reeled off nine straight wins after opening with a 1-1 draw at home to Sweden. His list of honors already makes for impressive reading having won the Bundesliga, German Cup, Champions League and Club World Cup during his time at Bayern, but Alaba is likely to find international success much harder to come by.

Not since the days of Toni Polster, the country's record goalscorer from the 1980s and 1990s, have Austria fielded talent quite like Alaba. He will shoulder a growing weight of expectation in France, but he says it will not be a strain. "I'm living my dream. Every morning I wake up and think to myself, cool, it doesn't get better than this!" he said, with a successful summer in France likely to catapult Alaba to the next level. —AFP

RASHFORD, TOWNSEND IN 26-MAN ENGLAND SQUAD

LONDON: Manchester United's teenage sensation Marcus Rashford and Newcastle United winger Andros Townsend were named in a provisional 26-man England squad for Euro 2016 yesterday. The uncapped Rashford, 18, has burst onto the scene with United this season, scoring seven goals in 16 games, while Townsend, who won the last of his 10 England caps in October, has impressed since joining Newcastle from Tottenham Hotspur in January. Arsenal's Jack Wilshere and Liverpool's Jordan Henderson were both included after recent spells on the sidelines, but there was no place for Wilshere's club-mate Theo Walcott. Explaining Rashford's call-up, England manager Roy Hodgson told a press conference at Wembley: "He deserves to be selected. It'll be interesting to see what he can do, even if he only has one week (in training) before I name the final 23. "There's no reason why he couldn't knock someone off their perch (and earn a place in the final squad). But that will be harder than some people expect." Hodgson must reduce his squad to 23 players for the tournament in France, which sees England drawn alongside Slovakia, Russia and neighbors Wales in Group B. Arsenal pair Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain and Danny Welbeck had already been ruled out of the tournament by injury, while Manchester United left-back Luke Shaw has not returned to action since sustaining a double leg break last

September. Everton centre-back Phil Jagielka Euro's." Townsend tweeted: "Huge honour to be was another high-profile absentee, having named in provisional @England squad for the struggled with injury in recent months, while euros.... Will give my all over next few weeks to there was an unexpected call-up for Manchester City midfielder Fabian Delph. Manchester United midfielder Michael Carrick, Everton leftback Leighton Baines and in-form Sunderland striker Jermain Defoe all missed out. Premier League champions Leicester City had two representatives in midfielder Danny Drinkwater and striker Jamie Vardy. Wilshere made his first start of the season for Arsenal in Sunday's 4-0 win over Aston Villa, having previously been sidelined by a fractured shin. "Absolutely buzzing!" he wrote on Twitter. "I can't wait to meet up with the squad and start preparing for the euros. Thanks for all the messages." On his decision to select Townsend over Walcott, Hodgson said: "They're both good players. They're very different players. They play in wide positions, but they're not similar players. "Andros was unlucky to lose his place when he was not getting a regular place. He's done very well at Newcastle. Theo has not had such regular games and has had a tough time with injuries." Walcott, who sat out Arsenal's win over Villa with a slight hamstring injury, was also omitted from Hodgson's squad for the 2014 World Cup. He wrote on Twitter: "I am of course disappointed not to make the squad, but I have spoken with Roy and respect his decision. I wish Roy and all the team the best of luck for a successful

try and make final squad!" England begin their final preparations for the Euro with a friendly against Turkey in Manchester on Sunday and will also tackle Australia and Portugal before departing for France early next month.

ICELAND'S DAVID BECKHAM **PROPELS EURO DEBUTANTS**

REYKJAVIK: With his status as the star player of his country's golden generation and his prowess from a dead ball, it is no surprise that Gylfi Sigurdsson has been labelled the Icelandic David Beckham. The 26-year-old attacking midfielder with a fierce right foot shot admits that he loved watching England stars Beckham and Frank Lampard when he was growing up. Now he is starring in the Premier League himself with Swansea City.

Nicknamed the Ice Man, Sigurdsson will get to enjoy the limelight of a major international tournament in the French heat after helping propel Iceland to Euro 2016. The North Atlantic island nation of 330,000 people has never previously been to a major tournament. It is set to become the smallest country by population ever to feature at a European Championship.

Sigurdsson was the outstanding performer in a remarkable qualifying campaign, scoring six goals as Iceland progressed with two games to spare at the expense of the once mighty Netherlands. Sigurdsson scored both goals as Iceland beat the Dutch 2-0 in Reykjavik and netted the winner from the penalty spot in a 1-0 triumph in Amsterdam.

He also scored four times in qualifying for the 2014 World Cup, when 'Str·karnir okkar' (Our Boys) only missed out on a place in Brazil in a play-off defeat to Croatia. "We just missed out in the play-offs and had to set ourselves another goal for the Euros, which was again to qualify.

"Of course, after seeing our draw, with the Netherlands, Czech Republic and Turkey all in the same group with us, some of us considered it an impossible target," Sigurdsson told FIFA.com. "But then to be able to finish the job off with two games to go is an unbelievable achievement and the

feeling that goes with it, to be on our way to the finals, is fantastic." Sigurdsson has overtaken former Chelsea and Barcelona star Eidur Gudjohnsen still going at 37 — as his country's top footballer after emerging in the team that reached the under-21 European Championship for the first time in 2011. He started with Breidablik before being lured to England by Reading as a raw 15-year-old. His parents moved with him and his father ran his Icelandic fishing business over the phone from Berkshire.

Celebrity couple

Signed by German side Hoffenheim in 2010, he came back to English football with Swansea City on loan in 2012 before signing for Tottenham Hotspur. However, he returned to Swansea in 2014 and in his first game scored the winner as the Welsh club beat Manchester United 2-1 at Old Trafford. He had 11 goals to his name at the end of April this season as he flourishes in the league he once loved watching on television. Some of his best efforts have come from dead balls, a skill he learnt from studying one of the best in the business. "Growing up as I kid I used to watch the Premier League and used to see David Beckham taking those kinds of free-kicks, so from a young age I was probably quite lucky to have him on the TV every week," he told FIFA.com.

"It was something I used to practice when I was in Iceland and just kept doing it after I left. "Beckham and Frank Lampard were the ones that I particularly liked watching, and with Lampard scoring so many goals from midfield it was hard not to look up to him." Also like Beckham, Sigurdsson forms one half of a celebrity couple, stepping out with a former Miss Iceland, Alexandra Ivarsdottir.— AFP

RONALDO ENTERS HIS LAST CHANCE SALOON FOR EURO, NATIONAL GLORY

LISBON: For a player that has won almost everything on an individual and collective level, the one honor that agonizingly evades Cristiano Ronaldo is an international trophy with Portugal. Euro 2016 will be Ronaldo's fourth and at 31 possibly last European Championship finals. The previous three have all promised much only to end in varying degrees of disappointment for the three-time World Player of the Year. There have also been tears and torment.

Cristiano Ronaldo dos Santos Aveiro has long been destined for greatness. In the year of his 16th birthday, he played for Sporting Lisbon's under-16, under-17, under-18, reserve and first teams. Two years later, he had been snapped up by Manchester United, whose boss Alex Ferguson had been impressed by the teenager in a United-Sporting friendly. The No. 7 shirt became synonymous with Ronaldo.

In 2004, Ronaldo announced his presence on the international stage, scoring twice as Portugal reached the final on home soil before suffering a devastating defeat to shock winners Greece. Four years later, Ronaldo looked set to make amends. He was at the prime of his career having led Manchester United to the Champions League a month before arriving in Austria and Switzerland.

Ghosts of Euro pasts

Yet, distracted by protracted rumours about his switch from United to Real Madrid-that would only come about a year later-Ronaldo found the net just once as after an impressive group stage, Portugal bowed out to Germany in the quarterfinals. Euro 2012 will arguably haunt the Madeira-born superstar the most.

Ronaldo came into the tournament on the back of a record-breaking 60-goal season with Madrid as they ended the dominance of Pep Guardiola's Barcelona side in Spain to win La Liga. His double against the Netherlands led Portugal out of the cliched group of death also including Germany. Ronaldo struck the winner against the Czech Republic in the quarter-finals, but watched on in anguish as Portugal again fell short by the finest of margins against a Spain side replete with Barca players exacted revenge on penalties in the semi-finals.

Never one to shy away from the big moment, Ronaldo's desire for glory got the better of him as he opted to take Portugal's fifth penalty. The problem was the shootout never got that far as Spain won 5-3 leaving Ronaldo to look ruefully at the Donetsk night sky claiming there was "no justice". As well the grand collective prize, there are also individual accolades on offer that will entice a record hoarder like Ronaldo.—AFP

FEDERATION CHIEF HAILS CONTE AFTER MATCH-FIXING ACQUITTAL

MILAN: Italian football federation (FIGC) president Carlo Tavecchio yesterday saluted Azzurri coach Antonio Conte, after he escaped a prison term by being acquitted of sporting fraud in a match-fixing affair.

Prosecutor Roberto di Martino had requested a six-month sentence for Italy coach Conte and a fine of 8.000 euros (\$9,063), as well as similar sanctions for his former assistant at Siena, Angelo Alessio, following accusations they failed to report episodes of match-fixing while Conte was in charge at Serie B side Siena in 2011.

Reports yesterday said Conte had been acquitted of the charges, allowing him to lead Italy into this summer's Euro 2016 before he takes over as Chelsea manager following the tournament. Tavecchio said he welcomed the news with "great satisfaction" and that it would allow Conte, who is set to name a preliminary 30-man squad for Euro 2016 later yesterday, to now fully focus on the job at hand.

"It was with great satisfaction that I heard news of Antonio Conte's acquittal by the Cremona Tribunal today," Tavecchio told the ANSA news agency. "Finally, his position has been clarified. My faith in him was never up for discussion. Now, we can be even more concentrated on the European Championships."

Four-month ban

Conte, who in 2012 served a four-month ban in relation to the affair, had been accused of not reporting an episode of

match-fixing relating to a Serie B match with AlbinoLeffe from May 2011 when he was coach of Siena. Although former players and other figures were implicated, Conte was the most notable. The 46-year-old former Juventus coach has always denied any wrongdoing in an affair in which players allegedly colluded with underworld figures to fix matches and recoup the rewards of an illegal betting network.

A lawyer for Conte, Francesco Arata, said last month: "He's a total stranger to the betting world and that's why he will be cleared by the judge." Alessio, Conte's assistant during three title-winning seasons at Juventus and now with him at Italy, risked a fourmonth sentence but was also acquitted. The affair, however, has yet to reach its conclusion and could see former players Beppe Signori, one of the top players in Serie A in his prime during a five-year spell with Lazio, among others, feel the full force of the law. The report said "up to 90" people are involved although Signori, Cristiano Doni, Gigi Sartor and Mauro Bressan-all former Serie A players-as well as current Lazio captain Stefano Mauri, are all in the dock facing accusations of transnational sporting fraud. Of those accused, Mauri is the only active player although he has already been sanctioned for his role in the affair. Mauri served a six-month ban for failing to report match-fixing, meaning he missed most of the start of the 2014-2015 season, returning to the fray on February 2014. — AFP

BARCELONA CELEBRATES WHILE MADRID CLUBS FOCUS ON CHAMPIONS LEAGUE

BARCELONA: With Barcelona celebrating yet another Spanish league title, Real Madrid and Atletico Madrid are already looking forward to an even bigger prize. After pushing Barcelona to the end in the Spanish league, the Madrid clubs quickly switched their focus to the Champions League final in two weeks in Milan.

One will return home as the European champion, the other will end the season without a title. But no matter what happens in Italy, both teams will take solace by having finished the league with their heads up, taking the title fight to the final days and making Barcelona work hard for the trophy.

Real Madrid won its final 12 games to finish only one point behind Barcelona, while Atletico won seven of its last eight, finishing three points behind. They were denied the trophy by a late charge by Barcelona, which won five straight to secure its second consecutive title, and sixth in eight seasons.

Although neither Madrid team won the league, fans were more pleased than frustrated when it was all over this weekend. And it didn't hurt as much to watch Barcelona celebrate knowing there's still a chance to win soccer's top club competition. "We did what we had to do and we're now thinking about our last remaining game," Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane said. "Now it's important to rest up, spend a few days with the family and forget about football. We'll come back raring to go in preparation for the final."

Quest for revenge

The European title would give Madrid a sensational ending to a season that appeared to be lost not long ago. Before its impressive final run in the Spanish league, Madrid season's had been marked by a demoralizing 4-0 home loss to Barcelona, a result that left "Los Blancos" in crisis and led to the eventual firing of coach Rafa Benitez. There was also the embarrassing disqualification from the Copa del Rey for using an ineligible player, and a signing ban handed down by FIFA for breaching rules registering players under the age of 18.

At one point in the league, Madrid trailed Barcelona by 12 points and many fans had given up hope of a comeback. In the Champions League, a shocking 2-0 loss at Wolfsburg put the team on the brink of elimination in the quarterfinals, and only a hat trick from Cristiano Ronaldo saved the team from an embarrassing early elimination. Finishing the league on a high helped boost the team's confidence ahead of the final in Milan. "Our aim was to put the pressure on and we've done that. It's great for us in terms of morale heading into the Champions League final," Madrid defender Sergio Ramos said. "We had hope, which is the last thing you want to lose. Now we have a beautiful Champions League final that we want to win to make it an unforgettable year."

The result of the final should help determine how successful Madrid's season will actually be. "I don't think that it has been a bad season," Madrid defender Dani Carvajal said. "Right now, I would give a positive assessment, but on the 28th we'll be able to judge whether the season has been a good or bad one." Atletico will be hoping to avenge the hurtful result from two years ago, when it lost to Madrid in extra time despite leading until the final minutes of regulation. Regardless of the result in Milan, Atletico again showed its worth this season both against Spanish rivals and top European clubs.

Atletico eliminated Barcelona and Bayern Munich on its way to the Champions League final, and was the team that challenged Barcelona the most in the Spanish league, staying in second place from early in the season until a disappointing late loss to last-place Levante last weekend. "The reason Barcelona struggled was because we were right there to be able to fight until the end," Atletico coach Diego Simeone said. "It makes us happy to be fighting with the best in the world." - AP

Rarely can a goal from Sergio Aguero have been greeted with such apathy, but the sound of the Manchester City star's irrelevant late strike barely being acknowledged by the chastened home support told the story of a defining day in the title race. Leicester arrived at Eastlands in February regarded in some quarters as a novelty act, whose time at the top would soon be over once a superpower like City had finished with them. But by the end of a bravura Leicester display, it was clear Claudio Ranieri's side were more than capable of completing their fairytale title bid. Robert Huth met Riyad Mahrez's free-kick to give the Foxes an early lead and Mahrez doubled the lead himself with a cool finish before German defender Huth sealed the points with another header to leave City stunned.

Norwich City 4 Liverpool 5

Arguably the most dramatic match of the season featured Liverpool's inconsistent attack at its dynamic best and Norwich's creaky defense at its very worst. Liverpool took the lead through Roberto Firmino before Norwich hit back with goals from Dieumerci Mbokani and Steven Naismith before half-time. Wes Hoolahan's penalty gave the hosts a 3-1 lead early in the second half. But back came Jurgen Klopp's team and three goals in 20 minutes from Jordan Henderson, Firmino and James Milner made it 4-3 with 15 minutes to go. Sebastien Bassong looked to have rescued a point for Norwich in the 92nd minute, but Alex Neil's

Liverpool 3 Arsenal 3

Few teams in the Premier League can surpass Arsenal for their jarring ability to combine moments of jaw-dropping brilliance and astounding ineptitude. Never was that frustrating split-personality more visible than at Anfield in January, in a game that became an instant classic. With a suitably dramatic snowstorm providing the backdrop, Liverpool playmaker Roberto Firmino scored twice in the first 20 minutes, including a superb long-range effort, either side of Aaron Ramsey's equaliser for Arsenal. Olivier Giroud netted twice for the Gunners to put them 3-2 ahead by the 55th minute, but Liverpool midfielder Joe Allen capped a breathless encounter when he slammed home a 90thminute equaliser.

Newcastle United 3 Manchester United 3

At first glance this January meeting between a Newcastle team painfully short of attacking quality and a Manchester United side constrained by manager Louis van Gaal's tactical conservatism should have been forgettable drab. Instead, they banished those preconceptions with a six-goal thriller. Wayne Rooney's penalty and Jesse Lingard's strike seemingly put United in control before Georginio Wijnaldum and Aleksandar Mitrovic's penalty levelled the scores. Rooney's sublime long-range second restored United's advantage in the 79th minute, only for Newcastle defender Paul Dummett to salvage a draw in the last minute.—AFP

RANIERI BRACES LEICESTER FOR BIG TEAM BACKLASH

LONDON: Leicester City manager Claudio Ranieri has told his players to expect the full force of the Premier League's leading clubs when they attempt to defend their fairytale title next season. Leicester concluded their astonishing campaign on Sunday with a 1-1 draw at deposed champions Chelsea, Ranieri's former club, which left the 5,000-1 outsiders 10 points clear at the top of the standings.

It was an accurate reflection of both their relentless consistency and the failings of the traditional elite, but with doubly determined domestic opposition to contend with in 2016-17, as well as Champions League football, Ranieri knows that, come August, Leicester will be marked men.

"We know if there is a fairytale next season, it will be no nightmare, but it's different next season," the jovial Italian told his post-match press conference at a sun-soaked Stamford Bridge. "We know very well we are fighting between 10, 11 (teams) to the high positions. I am sure all the big teams will go back. We continue to fight. That is our destiny. It was important to be ready when the other big teams together weren't."

He added: "The Champions League will be a very good experience for all my players. I think no-one played the Champions League (before). "It will be a very good atmosphere, with the music. I hope we are ready. Not to listen too much to the music, but to do some music." Before the game, Ranieri spoke to Chelsea owner Roman Abramovich, the man who had sacked him 12 years previously, and he revealed afterwards that the Russian had offered him "very warm" congratulations. Ranieri was also granted a guard of honour by Chelsea's players and received a rousing reception from the home fans, some of whom sang: "There's only one Ranieri!"

He lightheartedly admonished a reporter who asked him if he had had to fight back tears, saying: "No, no tears. Come on, man! Every time you are speaking about the tears." Leicester will parade the Premier League trophy in front of their adoring supporters during an open-top bus tour of the city yesterday, before departing for a post-season trip to Thailand, home country of owner Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha today.

Hen and egg

With a view to next season, Ranieri experimented with a 4-1-4-1 system against Chelsea that saw lone striker Jamie Vardy flanked by Riyad Mahrez and Demarai Gray. But he reverted to his usual 4-4-2 formation at half-time and revealed afterwards that he intends to begin next season "with the same shape".

Leicester looked to be heading to only their fourth defeat of the campaign after Cesc

Fabregas put Chelsea ahead with a 66th-minute penalty, only for Danny Drinkwater to drive home a 25-yard equalizer with eight minutes remaining.

The result saw Chelsea finish the season in 10th place and outgoing interim manager Guus Hiddink predicted that his successor, Antonio Conte, will not find it easy to return the club to the upper reaches of the table. "It's not easy because this season we were all very aware what other clubs can do as well," said Hiddink, who completed his second short-term stint at Chelsea. "Now everyone knows Leicester. We have seen Tottenham, but we have also seen West Ham. They were playing very well, very attractive. "Other clubs are knocking on the door and having more financial background next season and maybe smart recruiting. I don't think it's a done deal that the four established clubs from the past are the four established clubs for the future."

Hiddink, who revealed that he will return to the club to work with youngsters from Chelsea's academy, also urged patience over the future of captain John Terry, who is considering the offer of a one-year contract extension. "John Terry and the club are in contact and that is good," said the 69-year-old Dutchman. "We must not rock the boat. In Holland we say, don't disturb the hen that is sitting on the egg." — AFP

TORONTO SET TO FACE LEBRON'S CAVS LOWRY LEADS RAPTORS INTO CONFERENCE FINAL

TORONTO: Less than two weeks ago, Kyle Lowry was struggling so badly that he stayed past midnight to work on his game after a tough playoff loss. Now a redhot Lowry is carrying the Toronto Raptors into their first ever Eastern Conference finals. Lowry scored 35 points, DeMar DeRozan had 28 and the Raptors reached the conference finals by beating the Miami Heat 116-89 on Sunday. They play in Cleveland tonight. "I missed some shots I could have made, but we won the game," Lowry said. "That's all that matters. I'm going to keep pushing and try to be better, and do things to keep helping my team get wins."

After Toronto's overtime loss to Miami in Game 1, when Lowry scored seven points and missed 10-of-13 shots, he staved behind for more than an hour to practice his shooting alone while work crews picked up garbage from beneath the Air Canada Centre seats.

Things were a lot different in Sunday's Game 7 when Lowry topped 30 points for the second straight game and the third time in the series. A standing-room-only crowd of 20,257 cheered every one of Lowry's baskets, the game winding down, and then chanted "We want Cleveland" as the final seconds ticked away.

Franchise record

"That's just what he does," DeRozan said of Lowry. "He's been doing it all year, he won us countless games." Checking out early gave Lowry a chance to sit on the bench and soak in the scene as Toronto set franchise records for playoff points and margin of victory. "It was just a time to relax and just think about the things that we've done, and we have to continue to do," Lowry said.

Toronto will need both Lowry and DeRozan to continue pouring in points to have any chance against the Cavaliers, who are unbeaten so far this postseason. The two Raptors All-Stars have been inconsistent so far in the playoffs but seem to be finding their form at the right time. They've combined for more than 50 points in three straight games.

"They're our guys," Raptors coach Dwane Casey said. "They carried us all year. There were some moments of heart, you believed that those guys were going to come around." Toronto won two of three against the Cavaliers in the regular season, with both victories coming at home by a combined six points. Toronto's defeat was a lot more lopsided: they lost 122-100 in Cleveland on Jan. 4.

Tough task ahead

Scouting booklets for the Cleveland series were sitting on the chair of each Raptors player inside their locker room less than an hour after Sunday's game. "We know we've got a tough task ahead," Lowry said. "It's always a challenge going against those guys." Casey declined to say whether center Jonas Valanciunas, who sprained his right ankle in Game 3 against the Heat, would be available against Cleveland.

"He's still limping around but he's doing therapy 24/7 so we'll see," Casey said. Whether or not Valanciunas plays, Toronto must control Cleveland's All-Star trio of LeBron James, Kyrie Irving and Kevin Love.

FAKE BOMB AT MAN UNITED SPARKS NEW SECURITY FEARS

MANCHESTER: The discovery of a fake bomb inside Old cumstances. It was the first game in the Premier League's Trafford brought embarrassment and potentially a \$4 million bill to Manchester United, raising serious questions about the security arrangements in place at one of the world's biggest sports teams.

It was also a stark reminder of the vulnerability of sports stadiums ahead of upcoming events like the European Championship in France and the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, and the tense atmosphere that exists among sports fans and authorities after last year's Paris attacks.

United took no chances when a mobile-phone device, taped inside a bathroom cubicle in a corner of Old Trafford, was discovered by a member of staff shortly before the Premier League match against Bournemouth on Sunday. Two stands were evacuated immediately, and soon after the game was called off and the rest of the 75,000-seat stadium was evacuated.

Army bomb-disposal experts blew up the device, described by police as "incredibly lifelike," before police said hours later that it had been left behind by a private company following a security training exercise using search dogs on Wednesday. "Fiasco is the right word. It was shambolic," Greater Manchester Mayor Tony Lloyd said yesterday. "Of course, United are a huge organization. It wasn't, I think, the fact they're the world's richest club, it was the fact that the security had missed something that in the end ought to have been found."

Many people who were at the match have praised the way the evacuation by United was handled in unique cir24-year history that has been canceled on security grounds. United executive vice chairman Ed Woodward said he was "proud of how our staff responded" and deemed the evacuation a "complete success."

In a statement, Woodward said the private company had signed that the device had been recovered at the end of the training drill, and that the device "could not have been detected by sniffer dogs on the routine matchday search . as it contained no explosives and was used in an exercise training handlers not dogs."

Sharryn McKelvie, who attended the game as part of a group of 40 United fans from all over the world, gave a mixed assessment of the club's handling of the evacuation. She told The Associated Press that messages by stadium announcer "were starting to cause more panic among people."

"One of us asked a steward after the game was abandoned, 'What's the update, mate?" said McKelvie, who is a security manager for the University of Edinburgh. "He said the best thing you can do is go back to your car, turn the radio on and get an update that way. "I think it's outrageous that in this day and age, at a worldwide club that United is, that after a

training exercise they didn't have standards in place to check everything is finished at the end of it," McKelvie said. 'Somebody's head should roll for that one. It wasn't because of a random attack, it was because of somebody's stupidity that caused this chaos." — AP

More than 300 business chiefs yesterday urged Britain to vote to leave the EU in June's referendum, arguing in a joint letter that its bureaucracy stifled companies' ability to grow. APPLE'S LATEST INNOVATION: A BIG STAKE FOR BERKSHIRE

OMAHA: Investors might question Warren Buffett's long-standing aversion to tech stocks after his Berkshire Hathaway bought 9.8 million shares of Apple. Buffett has always avoided technology companies because he said it was too hard to pick which ones would prevail long term, although he made an exception to that rule to buy a major IBM stake in 2011.

The stake comes with the company's shares under considerable pressure. Billions in value have been wiped from the books since Apple reported a sizeable drop in iPhone sales in last April.

Shares, down 15 percent over the past month, jumped 3 percent yesterday. Buffett was also reported to be considering joining a bid to acquire Yahoo. But Buffett told CNBC yesterday he would only act as a potential financing partner for Quicken Loans founder Dan Gilbert's bid. Buffett didn't immediately respond to a message from The Associated Press early yesterday.

Buffett is known for investing in comparatively boring companies when he understands the industry well, such as Geico insurance, Wells Fargo, Coca-Cola, American Express and See's Candy. Buffett avoids investing in areas outside his expertise. Whenever Buffett is asked about technology investments, he usually explains his position in terms of candy and soda. Buffett says he thinks it's too hard to determine what tech com-

panies will be worth in the future because their businesses evolve so quickly, but he's certain Snickers candy bars and Coca-Cola will remain popular decades from now.

"Whenever you get a truly extraordinary business, they're the hardest ones to value," Buffett said last year on CNBC. "It's much easier for me to figure out what Coca-Cola is worth than Google or Facebook or you name it."

Berkshire revealed the new Apple investment yesterday in a filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission detailing a number of changes to its \$129 billion portfolio.

But the filing didn't disclose who made the Apple investment. Besides Buffett, Berkshire has two other investment managers, who each handle about \$9 billion. Buffett has said that his investments tend to be the larger ones in the portfolio. He says investments of less than \$1 billion are likely to be the work of Ted Weschler or Todd Combs. The Apple stake was worth about \$900 million yesterday. Berkshire also added 198,853 IBM shares during the quarter to give it 81.2 million shares. Buffett has stuck with IBM even though it continues to sell for less than the roughly \$170 a share he paid for most of the shares. — AP

ARAMCO AWARDS HASBAH GAS EXPANSION CONTRACT

KHOBAR: State oil giant Saudi Aramco has awarded a \$1 billion-plus contract to India's Larsen & Toubro (L&T) and Singaporebased Emas AMC for the expansion of the offshore Hasbah sour gas field, industry sources said.

Increasing its supply of gas is a top priority for Saudi Arabia. Many industrial firms have complained about a shortage crimping expansion plans, while the kingdom is trying to use more of the fuel for power generation and water desalination instead of burning crude oil, which it wants to export.

Work on the expansion scheme includes building platforms and pipelines, with the fieldís supply feeding the Fadhili gas plant, a \$6 billion complex that will include a gas processing unit and sulphur recovery. Saudi Aramco declined to comment. L&T did not respond to emailed requests for comment, while Emas was not available for

immediate comment. It is the second major contract win for the duo in recent months: Emas AMC, a unit of Ezra Holdings, also teamed up last year with the Indian firm to secure a long-term contract with Aramco to work on offshore facilities.

The expansion of Hasbah will supply 2 billion standard cubic feet per day (scfd) of gas to the Fadhili plant, for which Aramco awarded a construction contract last year. The remaining 500 million scfd of supply for the plant will come from the onshore Khursaniyah field.

Hasbah already feeds Wasit, another major gas plant. Aramco said in March it had started producing natural gas from the offshore field ahead of peak summer demand in the worldís largest oil exporting country. An industry source told Reuters the Wasit plant would reach full capacity in July of processing 2.5 billion scfd of gas. — Reuters

OIL PRICES RISE ON NIGERIA OUTAGES, GOLDMAN FORECAST

LONDON: Oil prices jumped over 2 percent vesterday to their highest since November 2015 on growing Nigerian oil output disruptions and after long-time bear Goldman Sachs said the market had ended almost two years of oversupply and flipped to a deficit.

Brent crude futures were trading at \$48.83 per barrel at 1118 GMT, up \$1 or 2.05 percent. US crude futures were up 98 cents, or 2.08 percent, at \$47.19 a barrel. Supply disruptions around the world of as much as 3.75 million barrels per day (bpd) have wiped out a glut that pulled down oil prices by as much as 70 percent between 2014 and early 2016. The disruptions triggered a U-turn in the outlook of Goldman Sachs, which had long warned of global storage hitting capacity and of yet another oil price crash to as low as \$20 per barrel. 'The oil market has gone from nearing storage saturation to being in deficit much earlier than we expected," Goldman said.

"The market likely shifted into deficit in May ... driven by both sustained strong demand as well as sharply declining production," it said. However, Goldman cautioned that the market would slip back into a surplus in the first half of 2017 as it said prices around \$50 per barrel in the second half of 2016 would see exploration and production activity picking up. In Nigeria, output has fallen to its lowest in decades following several acts of sabotage. In the Americas, US officials warned they were growing increasingly concerned by the possibility of an economic and political meltdown in Venezuela amid low oil prices. Venezuela's oil production has already fallen by at least 188,000 bpd this year. In the United States, crude production has fallen to 8.8 million bpd, 8.4 percent below 2015 peaks as the sector suffers a wave of bankruptcies. And in China, output fell 5.6 percent to 4.04 million bpd in April, year-on-year.

Countering this, supply rose from the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) as its producers are engaged in a race for market share. OPEC pumped 32.44 million bpd in April, up 188,000 bpd from March, the highest since at least 2008. Also preventing steeper price jumps was a recovery in output in Canada following closures due to a wildfire, as well as bloated global crude storages. "The inventory buffer may be preventing full price recovery and ... the market is rightly nervous about the sustainability of outages," said Morgan Stanley. Barclays said that "while the supply-side disruptions are supporting oil market balances, refinery margins are starting to weaken, especially in Asia," adding that weaker demand from those refiners could produce "downside risk to prices in Q3 16." — Reuters

INDIA'S MOBILITY REVOLUTION IS DRIVING GLOBAL OIL DEMAND

Vehicle penetration rate still remains low in India

LONDON: "India is taking over from China as the main growth market for oil," the International Energy Agency observed in its latest petroleum market update ("Oil Market Report", IEA, May 2016). India's oil consumption has grown at an average annual rate of 5 percent over the last decade and climbed over 4 million barrels per day for the first time in the year ending in March 2016. India is currently the world's fourth-largest oil consumer after the United States, China and Japan, and set to overtake Japan for the third slot within the next 12-18 months. Diesel remains the largest end market, accounting for more than 40 percent of all petroleum consumed in the country, according to the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas.

Liquid petroleum gas for cooking and petroleum coke for power generation are other major markets, each accounting for about 10 percent of final demand. Gasoline, by contrast, accounts for only 12 percent of total consumption, but is the fastest-growing segment, with demand rising by 10 percent a year for the last decade.

more than 14 percent in 2015/16. Growing gasoline demand is directly linked to the explosion in vehicle ownership among the country's rapidly expanding middle and lower-middle class. The number of registered vehicles on India's roads has been doubling every seven years and hit 182 million in 2013, according to the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways ("Road Transport Yearbook", 2012/13).

The majority of registered vehicles were motorcycles (133 million) with a much smaller number of cars, jeeps and taxis (25 million) and goods vehicles (9 million). The balance between two-wheeled and four-wheeled vehicles has remained fairly constant since the turn of the millennium. India still has a relatively low vehicle penetration rate compared with other developing countries let alone richer economies. There were just 149 vehicles for every 1,000 people in 2013 compared with 273 in Brazil, 277 in Mexico,

with 215 in Brazil, 450 in Britain and 540 in Germany. There is enormous potential for a further increase in both vehicle ownership and gasoline consumption as more and more households are able to afford to drive.

The largest number of vehicles are registered in the major urban centres of Delhi, Bengalaru, Chenai, Pune and Mumbai, and the large states of Maharashtra, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu and Gujarat, all of which have a large number of relatively wealthy households.

But the fastest growth rates in vehicle ownership over the last 10 years has been in relatively poor and peripheral states such as Tripura, Mizoram, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Bihar, Uttarakhand and Chhattisgarh, which suggests vehicle ownership is rapidly spreading to a much wider cross-section of the population. Provided India's economy continues to grow, and fuel prices remain moderate, India's thirst for gasoline will be the most important source of oil demand growth over the next few years. The country is set to join the United States and China in a new group of Big 3 oil consuming countries. — Reuters

NIGERIAN INFLATION HITS NEAR 6-YEAR HIGH IN APRIL

LAGOS: Annual inflation in Nigeria quickened to a near six-year high of 13.7 percent in April, in part due to rising petrol and electricity prices, the National Bureau of Statistics said yesterday, stoking expectations of another rate hike. Nigeria's worst economic crisis in decades has been driven by a sharp drop in oil prices that has slashed government revenues since the country relies on crude sales for around 70 percent of national income.

Gross domestic product growth was just 2.8 percent last year, its lowest rate since 1999, and speculation of a devaluation of the naira currency is growing. March inflation was 12.8 percent. The statistics bureau (NBS) said the higher inflation rate in April - the highest level since August 2010, according to Thomson Reuters data - reflected increases across all sectors. In March, Nigeria's central bank tightened monetary policy, raising the benchmark interest rate to 12 percent from 11 percent to try to curb the galloping inflation - a surprise reversal that came just four months after rates were cut. "The focus inevitably shifts to what sort of monetary policy reaction to anticipate," said Razia Khan, chief economist, Africa at Standard Chartered bank, looking ahead to the monetary policy committee meeting due next Monday and Tuesday. "With the central bank governor previously stating that a headline inflation rate in excess of the MPR (benchmark interest rate) is undesirable, expectations of tightening are likely to build," she said.

NBS said petrol prices and electricity tariffs were major factors in the inflation rise. Last week, the government announced it was scrapping a costly fuel subsidy scheme and increasing petrol prices by up to 67 percent which will affect many of Nigeria's 180 million people who rely on gasoline to power electricity generators as well as transport. The new prices have yet to feed into the inflation figures, but NBS data suggests fuel was already generally sold at a higher price than the new official ceiling throughout much of April, meaning more inflationary pressure could be building. Food prices, which account for the bulk of the inflation basket, rose 13.2 percent in April, up 0.4 percentage points from March, the bureau said on its website.

Inflation has also been fuelled by pressure on the naira, which yesterday slipped to its weakest level in months against the dollar in the non-deliverable forward market. Speculation that the central bank will soon devalue the currency - which the bank denied on Sunday - has swirled since the vice president last week said foreign currency policies needed to be changed to encourage investment. — Reuters

UAE'S NETWORK INTERNATIONAL CLOSES \$350M ACQUISITION LOAN

LONDON: UAE payment processing firm Network International has closed a \$350mequivalent, six-year loan to finance the acquisition of Emerging Markets Payments (EMP), a payments processing company with its main operations in Africa and the Middle East, banking sources said yesterday.

The dual-currency financing is split almost evenly between a conventional dollar tranche and a murabaha dirham tranche, one banker close to the deal said. Citigroup acted as sole underwriter and coordinator on the deal and was joined in syndication by around nine international

banks, the banker said. After strong demand in syndication the pricing was reverse flexed by 25bp with final pricing coming in at 350bp for the dollar tranche and 325bp for the dirham tranche. The bolton acquisition follows the 49 percent acquisition of Network International by sponsors Warburg Pincus and General Atlantic in December 2015 for \$275m. Dubai's largest bank. Emirates, owns the rest. That deal was structured at the Warburg

Pincus/General Atlantic level through a specific 'holdco' vehicle - created by the sponsors for the acquisition. — Reuters

EUROPEAN VOTE AGAINST CHINA MARKET STATUS NOT 'CONSTRUCTIVE': BEIJING

BEIJING: A European Parliament vote against granting China market economy status in the World Trade Organization was "not at all constructive", Beijing's foreign minister said yesterday as he met his French counterpart. The designation would make it much harder for Brussels to fight Beijing over alleged unfair trading practices.

China joined the WTO in 2001, and argues that accession protocols dictate it will automatically switch over to market economy status by this December, 15 years later.

But European lawmakers in Strasbourg last week voted overwhelmingly against issuing the designation, concerned that doing so would cost Europe job losses in key industries such as steel.

"We believe that this European Parliament decision was not at all constructive," Chinese foreign minister Wang Yi said at a joint press conference with his visiting French counterpart Jean-Marc Ayrault. Wang urged the EU to take an "objective look" at the issue and respect WTO rules. "As a member of the WTO, the EU must fulfil its promises and not deny or avoid the issue," he said, adding: "China's wish is clear, simple and reasonable: that everyone should remember the commitments they have made."

China is the world's second-largest economy, and is the EU's second-largest trading partner, with daily trade flows of over \$1 billion.

It is also the world's top steelmaker, producing more than half of global output, and has been accused of flooding the world market with oversupply sold at below cost, in violation of global trade rules.

In the non-binding resolution, MEPs urged that Chinese exports be treated in a "non-standard way" so as to "ensure a level playing field for EU industry and defend EU jobs", the European Parliament said on its website. The European Commission, the EU's executive arm, has given itself until this summer to decide on whether China should be granted the status.

Commissioner Vytenis Andriukaitis, Lithuania's representative to the EU executive, told MEPs that the Commission all but ruled out doing so, saying that "any such move would be untenable". — AFP

GANNETT RAISES BID FOR TRIBUNE PUBLISHING

NEW YORK: USA Today owner Gannett has boosted its takeover bid for Tribune Publishing Co by about 22 percent one week after the owner of the Los Angeles Times, Chicago Tribune and other newspapers adopted a "poison pill" plan to thwart the unable to the term of the newspapers

Gannett's attempts to acquire Tribune come after a shake-up at the company. In February, Chicago investor Michael W. Ferro Jr. gave Tribune a \$44.4 million cash utive chairman of the newspaper publisher. Weeks later, the company ousted its CEO and named Justin Dearborn to that key job. "Our increased offer demonstrates our commitment to engaging in serious and meaningful negotiations with the Tribune Board to reach a mutually agreeable transaction where Gannett acquires all of Tribune," said a statement from Gannett chairman John Jeffry Louis. "It is evident from our discussions with Tribune shareholders that there is overwhelming support for the companies to engage immediately regarding our proposed transaction. By increasing our offer at this time, we are reaffirming Gannett's belief that this transaction would deliver significant value to both companies' stakeholders and that the time to act is now." Tribune Publishing issued a statement acknowledging it received the offer amounting to \$15 per share, adding that its board "will thoroughly review" the revised proposal. — Agencies

GOLD GAINS GROUND AS EQUITIES, DOLLAR RETREAT

LONDON: Gold rose yesterday, recovering after its biggest weekly loss since mid-March, as stock markets eased on soft Chinese data, boosting interest in the metal as an alternative asset, and the dollar weakened against the euro. Spot gold was up 0.6 percent at \$1,280.95 an ounce at 1140 GMT, while US gold futures for June delivery were up \$10.50 at \$1,283.20. The metal ended last week down 1.2 percent after a sharp midweek slide, though it rebounded by 0.8 percent on Friday. "Gold had a better close (last week) than one would have thought a few days earlier, and it seems to be putting in quite an impressive spell," Societe Generale analyst Robin Bhar said. "The trigger may be the softer China data we've had, with some misses on industrial production, retail sales. That's supporting the gold price." "I thought it might break down once we started testing below \$1,270, but it didn't. That may have wrong-footed some of the people who went short." European shares fell in subdued trade yesterday. Data from China over the weekend was less rosy, with April's retail sales, factory output and fixed-asset investment all falling short of forecasts by economists polled by Reuters. The dollar eased by 0.1 percent against the euro. Gold has risen 20 percent this year after weak economic data in the United States and elsewhere tempered expectations of a near-term increase in US interest rates, which would lift the opportunity cost of holding non-yielding gold. "Fed hikes are the only obstacle to a sustained bull market," Bank of America Merrill Lynch said in a note. "We anticipate a normalisation of rates, but don't think aggressive hikes are likely." Among other precious metals, silver was up 1 percent at \$17.30 an ounce, platinum rose 0.7 percent to \$1,054.29 and palladium was up 0.3 percent at \$590.72 an ounce. As industry participants gathered in London on Monday for Platinum Week, the World Platinum Investment Council said in a report that a drop in South African mine supply is set to deepen the deficit in the platinum market this year. —Reuters

US HOMEBUILDER SENTIMENT HOLDS STEADY IN MAY

NEW YORK: US homebuilders' confidence held steady in May for the fourth month in a row, reflecting an overall optimistic outlook for the new-home market even as the pace of sales has slowed recently.

The National Association of Home Builders/Wells Fargo builder sentiment index released yesterday was unchanged at 58. Readings above 50 indicate more builders view sales conditions as good, rather than poor. The index had been in the low 60s for eight months until February.

Builders' view of current sales and a measure of traffic by prospective buyers held steady. Builders' outlook for sales over the next six months increased to the highest level since December.

The US housing market looks more tempered after strong growth in 2015. Sales of new homes slid to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 511,000 in March, the third monthly decline in a row.

Even so, sales in the January-March period were running slightly ahead of the year-todate pace in 2015. April's sales figures are due out next week. Despite the sluggish start to the year, some economists see the low mortgage rates and improving job market as strong enough to boost sales in the coming months.

The new-home market still has a long way to go to recover from the housing crash of almost a decade ago. New-home sales are significantly below the half-century average of more than 650,000 a year.

Builders still anticipate sales growth, although they have become slightly more cautious in recent months. "Job creation, low mortgage interest rates and pent-up demand will also spur growth in the single-family housing sector moving forward," said Robert Dietz, the NAHB's chief economist.

This month's builder index was based on 259 respondents. Builders' view of sales over the next six months rose three points to 65, the highest reading since December.


A gauge of traffic by prospective buyers held at 44, while a measure of current sales conditions for single-family homes remained unchanged at 63. Though new homes represent only a fraction of the housing market, they have an outsized impact on the economy. Each home built creates an average of three jobs for a year and generates about \$90,000 in tax revenue, according to NAHB data. — AP

GOLD RISES AS RISK APPETITE LIFTS COMMODITIES

LONDON: Gold rose yesterday, recovering some of the previous session's losses, as a heightened appetite for risk in wider markets boosted commodities, and as markets mulled the timing of a potential US rate rise after some downbeat economic data. Fresh inflows were seen into gold-backed exchange-traded funds on Monday, with holdings of the largest, New York-listed SPDR Gold Shares, climbing to their highest since October at 24.65 million ounces.

Spot gold was up 0.5 percent at \$1,281.10 an ounce at 1100 GMT, while U.S. gold futures for April delivery were up \$5.10 an ounce at \$1,282.00. Commodities benefited from a rise in the risk appetite, as European stocks were lifted by hopes of an agreement on the Greek debt standoff. Benchmark Brent crude

oil rose 3.2 percent, while copper was up 3 percent. "The move higher here is much more reflective of moves elsewhere in the commodities sector as a whole, rather than a gold-related move," Simon Weeks, head of precious metals at the Bank of Nova Scotia, said. "This often happens in the short term, gold moves as a commodity rather than a currency."

Gold prices rose more than 8 percent in January to post their strongest month in three years, though expectations for a US interest rate rise later in the year kept a lid on gains.

The metal remains sensitive to US data, as traders try to anticipate when the Federal Reserve will raise rates. Downbeat reports on US consumer spending and factory activity helped gold pare losses on Monday, and non-farm payrolls numbers on Friday will be closely watched. Gold picked up some support from news the Australian central bank had cut rates, analysts said, following policy easing moves by authorities in Canada, Russia, Singapore and Denmark. "Gold is benefiting from the RBA's rate cut, a step that will accelerate the global depreciation race of currencies," Commerzbank said in a note on Tuesday. "Other central banks will probably follow suit and also cut their interest rates... As a result, gold will be more attractive as a store of value and alternative currency, a view evidently shared by ETF investors." Among other precious metals, silver was up 2.4 percent at \$17.61 an ounce. Platinum was up 0.7 percent at \$1,232 an ounce, while palladium was up 1.2 percent at \$793 an ounce. — Reuters

Total launches mammoth gas plant in Britain's Shetlands

SHETLAND, United Kingdom: Total officially launched yesterday a huge new gas project in Britain's remote Shetland Islands, hailed by London as a "vote of confidence" in the flagging North Sea oil and gas industry. The French energy giant officially opened the Shetland Gas Plant in Britain's northernmost outpost, which cost £3.5 billion (\$5 billion, 4.4 billion euros) to build.

Bringing in gas from the Laggan-Tormore fields, the plant began production on February 7, which has since been ramped up to its full capacity of 500,000 cubic feet of gas (90,000 barrels of oil equivalent) per day. The fields are expected to last for about 20 years. The Scottish North Sea oil and gas

sector has been reeling from a plunge in oil prices since mid-2014, leading the British government to cut taxes for the industry.

Amber Rudd, the minister for energy and climate change, called the opening of the Shetland project a "vote of confidence in the offshore oil and gas industry". The plant was "creating jobs and providing secure, affordable energy to the UK's families and businesses for decades to come", she said in a statement. "North Sea oil and gas is crucial to our energy mix. "We are 100 percent committed to helping our oil and gas industry attract investment, unlock new potential and remain competitive for the future." The Laggan-Tormore fields lie around 80 miles (125 kilometres)

northwest of Shetland. Total chief executive Patrick Pouyanne said the project demonstrated the company's "commitment" to Britain and said it would help the country's long-term energy security. "This subseato-shore development is the first of its kind in the country and will provide the domestic market with eight percent of its daily gas requirements while enabling the potential for further developments in the West of Shetland area," Pouyanne said in a statement.

Located in up to 600 metres (1,970 feet) of water, the five wells tap reservoirs that lie 3,500 to 3,900 metres (11,500 to 12,800 feet) beneath the sea floor. The gas is treated at the Shetland plant before the processed gas is piped into Britain's main grid. Total claimed the plant was Britain's biggest construction project since the London 2012 Olympics, employing 2,500 people at the peak of construction. Laggan-Tormore is operated by Total with junior partners Denmark-headquartered DONG Energy and British energy company SSE, which each have a 20 percent interest. The Shetland Islands are around 105 miles (165 kilometers) northeast of the Scottish mainland. Shetland was invaded by Vikings in the late eighth and early ninth centuries. The archipelago was pledged to Scotland by the king of Norway in 1469 but the Norwegian spirit lives on in street and place names and islanders celebrate their Norse roots. — AFP

THAILAND'S Q1 GDP SURPRISINGLY RESILIENT

BANGKOK: Thailand's economy outpaced expectations in the first guarter to expand at the fastest annual rate in three years, providing some relief for a military government that has struggled to stimulate growth in the two years since it seized power.

But with exports expected to shrink for a fourth year running and consumption crimped by high household debts and the worst drought in a decade, economists say more fiscal stimulus and lower interest rates may be needed to prevent growth momentum from stalling.

Southeast Asia's second-largest economy grew a seasonally adjusted 0.9 percent in the first quarter, boosted by government spending and tourism, the National Economic and Social Development Board (NESDB) said on Monday. The pace was faster than 0.8 percent in the fourth quarter and 0.6 percent forecast in a Reuters poll.

From a year earlier, growth was 3.2 percent, better than 2.8 percent previously and higher than economists' estimates. Thailand's economy remains fragile two years after a

years due to tepid global demand and China's slowdown. Despite the upside surprise in GDP, the Bank of Thailand could still cut rates if growth falters, economists say. "With likely subtrend growth momentum and baht outperforming regional currencies, we do not think one can rule out another rate cut by the BOT later this year," said Santitarn Sathirathai, senior economist at Credit Suisse in Singapore. The BOT held rates steady last week but saw higher risks to growth from slowing consumption and investment. The NESDB revised its 2016 GDP growth forecast to 3.0-3.5 percent from 2.8-3.8 percent. Growth last year was 2.8 percent.

Tourism and fiscal spending will underpin growth this year, while expected mid-year rains should ease drought, NESDB head Porametee Vimolsiri told reporters. In a bid to spur domestic activity, the junta has ramped up investment and launched stimulus measures, although big infrastructure projects have been slow to get underway.

In January-March, government investment rose 12.4 percent on year while private invest-

NIGERIA GOVT TO MEET UNIONS **OVER NATIONAL STRIKE THREAT**

67% HIKE IN PETROL PRICE FUELS RESENTMENT. PROTESTS

LAGOS: Nigeria's government was yesterday meeting union leaders to try to prevent a planned national strike over a 67 percent hike in the price of petrol, the labor ministry said. Ministry spokesman Samuel Olowookere told AFP the talks would take place in Abuja and involve government officials, the Nigeria Labor Congress (NLC) and its affiliates.

The NLC and the Trade Union Congress (TUC) have called for an indefinite strike from tomorrow unless petrol prices were slashed from 145 naira (\$0.73, 0.64 euros) to 86.50 naira per litre.

Government offices, airports, sea ports and businesses, including banks, shops and markets, would be shut if talks failed, the unions warned, calling on people to stockpile food. Any industrial action would exacerbate economic pressures in Africa's largest economy caused by the global slump in crude prices, which has drastically cut revenue from oil sales.

Subsidy system

The government last week increased the price of petrol and deregulated the fuel import market to try to end shortages caused by a foreign exchange crisis. The global oil shock has weakened the naira against the dollar but despite black market forex rates of about 350, the government has refused to devalue the currency, keeping the official rate at 197-199.

Fuel importers have not been bringing in supplies because of their inability to source forex at the official market rate, causing lengthy queues at filling stations. Wranglings over subsidy payments between importers and the government have previously led suppliers to withhold fuel deliveries in a system widely criticized as open to abuse. OPEC-member Nigeria, which has also seen production cut by militant attacks on facilities in recent weeks, depends on fuel imports because of a lack of domestic refining capacity. The government has kept prices at the pump low and paid the difference to fuel

importers but with overall oil revenue squeezed it can no longer afford to subsidize at 86.50 naira per litre. Because of the lack of fuel, motorists have been paying upwards of 145 naira per litre for months.

Economic 'tailspin'

A previous attempt to end fuel subsidies in January 2012 saw petrol prices more than double but the government was forced to partially reinstate them after widespread protests. But there were indications the unions may have misjudged the public mood this time around.

"(The NLC) should realise that Nigeria is already in a tailspin and cannot afford any strike that will worsen the nation's economic woes at this time," said Lagos stockbroker Sola Oni. "Besides, the new price (of petrol) will end the fraudulent subsidy regime that has only enriched a few Nigerians," added Oni, from Sofunix Investments and Communications.

Public affairs commentator Quincy Durodola also questioned the timing of the union threat. "NLC was quiet when their members in IPMAN (Independent Petroleum Marketers Association of Nigeria) collected subsidies and still sold above the subsidized rates," he said.

"It never saw anything wrong with that." The unions should support government efforts to make the oil sector more transparent and efficient, rather than create "unnecessary" labor unrest, he added. — AFP

Hedge funds turn cautious on crude

military coup ended months of political unrest as its main growth engines - exports and domestic demand - remain weak.

"Thailand's economy got off to a solid start to 2016, but high household debt and continued political uncertainty are likely to drag down growth again over the coming quarters," said Krystal Tan, economist at Capital Economics based in Singapore. The NESDB expects exports to shrink 1.7 percent this year, versus 1.2 percent growth it predicted earlier. Accounting for about two-thirds of GDP, exports have fallen in the past three ment grew 2.1 percent. Tourism, accounting for 10 percent of GDP, has been a rare bright spot. Anti-Chinese sentiment in Taiwan and Hong Kong have resulted in more Chinese tourists for Thailand.

Tourist numbers in the first quarter jumped 15.5 percent, and the NESDB predicts a record 33 million visitors this year. "It's the case of more Chinese who travel to Taiwan coming to Thailand, maybe about 5 percent more," Vichit Prakobgosol, president of CCT Group told Reuters. The group brought in 300,000 Chinese tourists last year. — Reuters

LONDON: "The oil market has gone from nearing storage saturation to being in deficit much earlier than we expected," Goldman Sachs analysts said in a research note published on Sunday. "The physical rebalancing of the oil market has finally started," according to the bank, which has been among the most bearish on the outlook for surpluses and prices.

Goldman raised its near-term forecasts for WTI by around \$10 per barrel in both the second and third guarters of 2016 ("Fundamental volatility creates uncertain path for oil rebalancing", Goldman Sachs, May 15). In many ways the bank is playing catch up, because WTI has already risen \$20, almost 80 percent, from its low on Feb. 11. Goldman is exceptionally well connected with the hedge fund community and its forecasts are famous for influencing oil prices, at least in the short term. But Goldman and the majority of hedge funds parted company on the oil outlook at the start of the year ("Oil price ultra-bear Goldman Sachs turns mildly bullish", Reuters, May 16). While the bank remained cautious about market rebalancing and warned about the possible correction in prices, hedge funds were amassing a record bullish position in futures and options in anticipation of a recovery. Between the start of January and the end of April, hedge funds and other money managers almost tripled their net long position in WTI and Brent futures and options from 234 million barrels to a record 663 million barrels.

Long positions anticipating a rise in prices were increased by 133 million barrels while short position expecting a price fall were cut by 208 million barrels. In the past couple of weeks, however, just as Goldman was turning more bullish, the hedge funds have become more cautious and been taking profits following the rally.

The combined net long position in WTI and Brent was cut by 43 million barrels in the week to May 3 and a further 45 million barrels in the week to May 10, an overall reduction of almost 13 percent. Most of the adjustment has come from the long side of the market, as hedge funds have locked in some of their profits, with more modest amounts of fresh shorts emerging.

The balance of forces in the oil market between supply-demand fundamentals, hedge fund positions and oil prices has become rather complicated. As Goldman noted, the fundamental picture has become more bullish in recent weeks, with continued evidence of strong oil demand from the United States and India, and a growing number of large supply disruptions.

A range of price indicators also suggest that the rally in oil prices, which appeared to have run out of steam in the first few of May, has acquired renewed drive ("Oil rally loses momentum", Reuters, May 11). Front-month futures prices have hit fresh highs and moved back above the 20-day moving average, suggesting that the rally has momentum. Time spreads, which are often correlated with the supplydemand balance, have tightened again in the last week. Refining margins, as typified by generic markers such as the 3-2-1 crack spread, have

also showed renewed strength after weakening in the first week of May. All these signals could attract more interest from hedge funds on the long side of the market. The whole oil and products complex remains well bid, pushing more bearish traders and analysts to the margins.

But oil prices have already risen a long way from their February lows anticipating the rebalancing which is now occurring. The concentration of hedge fund long positions continues to overhang the market, heightening the risk of a price reversal if speculators all try to exit their positions at the same time.

And the big rise in prices since the start of the

year will throw a lifeline to some producers, which could delay the completion of the rebalancing process. Overall, the risks in the oil market now appear much more evenly balanced than at the start of the year, which creates more uncertainty about near-term market direction. In the longer term, oil prices probably have to rise further to moderate the growth in demand and incentivize more investment in supply. On the present trajectory, the oil market is headed for a big supply deficit by 2018/19. But in the short term, the market has already recorded most of the price increases that were expected for 2016 and 2017 just a few months ago. — Reuters

MANUFACTURING IN NEW York contracts in May

WASHINGTON: Factory activity in New York shrank in May after expanding for two months, as manufacturers received fewer orders and shipments fell. The Federal Reserve Bank of New York said Monday that its Empire State manufacturing index slumped to minus 9 in May, after reaching 9.6 the previous month. Any reading below zero points to contraction. The figures indicate that factories in the state continue to struggle despite growth in March and April. Factory output nationwide has been sluggish in the past year as a weak global economy has lowered exports and US businesses are spending less on equipment and machinery.

A measure of new orders fell to minus 5.5, from 11.1 the previous month. That suggests factory output may contract again next month. And a gauge of shipments also slipped into negative territory, falling to minus 1.9 from 10.2. The employment index was little changed. But a

measure of hours worked declined, evidence that factory workers put in fewer hours and will receive slightly smaller paychecks as a result.

An index of capital spending by New York manufacturers, which measures their plans to spend on large equipment, fell to its lowest level in more than two years. US manufacturing has started to improve a bit in recent months, according to nationwide data, but growth remains tepid. Factories were held back last year by a strong dollar, which makes US products more expensive overseas. But the dollar has declined since January, giving manufacturers some relief.

The Institute for Supply Management, a trade group of purchasing managers, said earlier this month that its manufacturing index topped 50, a sign of expansion, for the second straight month in April. That index had been below 50 for five months until March. — AP

RUSSIA'S VTB BANK **RETURNS TO PROFIT MOSCOW:** Russia's second largest bank VTB

yesterday announced a return to profit in the first quarter, saying "stabilization" in the Russian economy had boosted revenues, although by less than analysts had expected. Between January and March, state-controlled VTB posted a net profit of 600 million rubles (\$9.24 million), after a 18.3-billionruble loss in the same period last year.

Analysts contacted by Interfax news agency had predicted higher profits of 5.8 billion rubles, however. VTB chief Andrei Kostin said the results reflected "the continued stabilisation of business activity in the Russian economy as a whole" after the "volatility seen in the same period a year ago." In the first quarter of 2015, Russia was suffering a monetary and economic crisis due to falling oil prices and Western sanctions imposed over the conflict in Ukraine, with the ruble plunging in value and the central bank sharply hiking the interest rate.

While Russia remains in recession, recent months have seen signs of stabilisation, particularly in the service sector, although industrial production remains low. In the first quarter, VTB's income from interest on loans more than doubled to 98.3 billion rubles, while income from fees and commission was up 13 percent at 17.4 billion rubles. This revenue growth led to a 31-percent growth in operating income to 111.1 billion rubles. However, while provision for low-quality loans was down 17 percent, it remained high at 40.6 billion rubles. — AFP

BRAZIL GOVT SAYS JOBS, **CONFIDENCE PRIORITIES**

RIO DE JANEIRO: Brazil's interim president, Michel Temer, said in a televised interview Sunday that he hopes to reduce unemployment and bring economic and political calm to Latin America's biggest country. Temer, a centrist who took over as interim president last week after Brazil's senate voted to suspend Dilma Rousseff and try her for irregularities in the government budget, said his government would cut public spending where possible and that a reform of Brazil's pension system was essential.

Repeating a pledge made last week, Temer said the cost-cutting would not affect popular social programs that marked the 13-year rule of Rousseff's Workers Party. Brazil's newly formed government is scrambling to identify economic reforms to revive an economy in its worst recession since the Great Depression. In addition to a gaping budget deficit, it must control near double-digit inflation and rising unemployment. Temer, who was the leftist Rousseff's vice president, will remain interim president for the duration of her trial, which could last as long as six months and is expected to lead to her ouster. He said he would not seek the presidency if he serves out the rest of the term, which goes through 2018.

Asked what he would like his legacy to be if he remains in office, Temer said: "reduce unemployment and see a calmed country." In the recorded interview with Globo, Brazil's biggest television network, Temer also said he would not interfere with corruption probes that have upended Brazilian politics in recent years, ensnaring dozens of political and corporate leaders and helping weaken the Rousseff administration.

In a separate interview with the same program, Brazil's new finance minister, Henrique Meirelles, also said spending cuts would not affect existing social programs and identified "confidence" as the country's worst economic problem. Meirelles, a former banking executive who served as central bank president during the first two Workers Party administrations, said the government needs to make up for revenue shortfalls but has not yet decided whether to raise any new taxes, included a much-discussed levy on financial transactions. — Reuters

DETROIT'S AUTOMAKERS, SENSING A THREAT, EMBRACE MOBILITY

DEARBORN, Michigan: For Detroit, the days of simply making cars are over. Automakers are facing multiple threats to their business from nimble tech firms like Apple and Uber. In response, carmakers are reinventing themselves as "mobility" companies that can accommodate all the different ways people get around.

Already this year, General Motors Co. has announced a long-term alliance with ride-hailing company Lyft and started a car-sharing service called Maven. Ford created a technologyfocused division based in Silicon Valley that will invest in promising transportation startups. It also launched FordPass, a smartphone app that helps users find parking or share their cars. Fiat Chrysler Automobiles is partnering with Google to test self-driving software in 100 of its minivans.

In congested and expensive cities, people are increasingly content to share cars or summon rides using their smartphones. In five years, 35 million people globally will be using car-sharing services, up from 5.8 million now, according to Boston Consulting Group. That means 550,000 fewer cars sold each year. Within another few decades, fleets of self-driving taxis could replace the need for personal car ownership altogether. Automakers that don't adapt risk being supplanted by high-tech competitors.

"We're investing in future-proofing," says Elena Ford, who led the development of FordPass and is the great-great-granddaughter of Ford's founder. There are dangers. Making vehicles is complicated and expensive, and car companies have stumbled when they've taken on new businesses. GM bought software maker Electronic Data Systems Inc. in 1984 but sold it 12 years later. Ford owned Hertz rental cars but sold it a decade ago. Chrysler owned airplanemaker Gulfstream in the mid-1980s. In each case, the companies sold those businesses to refocus on car-making.

There's also the open question of whether drivers want automakers to do more than make cars. Ford CEO Mark Fields is confident they do. "It goes back to Henry Ford and one of his favorite quotes: 'If I asked people what they wanted, they'd say they wanted a faster horse," Fields told The Associated Press. "We want to transform, fundamentally, the relationship between an automaker and a customer." ice, in 2008; it now operates in 29 cities in Europe and North America. BMW started a New Yorkbased mobility venture capital firm in 2011. Toyota has 70 tiny electric cars zipping around Grenoble, France, as part of its own car-sharing service. But after surviving the recession, Detroit is enjoying record US sales and plowing the profits into mobility experiments.

Aggressive

GM has been the most aggressive of the Detroit companies. In January, it invested \$500 million in Lyft and said it will co-develop a service that lets customers summon self-driving cars. Three months later, it paid a rumored \$1 billion for Cruise Automation, a startup that makes autonomous vehicle software. Around the same time, it launched Maven, a car-sharing service in Ann Arbor and Chicago.

GM President Dan Ammann said that when GM sees potential value, it can't afford to sit back and see where the market heads. "We believe in speed," Ammann said.

So far, Wall Street is on board. Colin Langan, an auto analyst with UBS, said investors understand the need to invest in new mobility, and expect companies to spend hundreds of millions of dollars a year doing so. But alarm bells may go off if they're routinely spending more.

"Historically, automakers have not been good allocators of cash," Langan said. Fiat Chrysler CEO Sergio Marchionne says it's dangerous for automakers to place big bets on one solution. He stresses that FCA's partnership with Google is open-ended and not exclusive. If the companies decide to keep working together, they will eventually hammer out details like licensing fees for the software.

"Walking in a collaborative fashion with people who have historically been viewed as intruders and potential enemies of our business - walking with them at their speed - is the best possible solution for us in terms of determining what our future state will be," he said. Ford has done much of its mobility work inhouse. The company has run more than 30 global mobility experiments over the past 18 months, including a concept in India that lets multiple families or co-workers share a car and a ride-hailing van service for workers on its Dearborn campus. But Fields says Ford is flexible and open to partnerships. Its FordPass app was developed alongside Pivotal, a Silicon Valley software company in which it has invested \$182 million. FordPass lets Ford owners remotely start their cars and make car payments. Users of the free app - who don't have to own Fords - can also reserve and pay for parking spots, get help from a live operator, rent their cars through FlightCar and earn points at partners like McDonald's. Ford will continue adding features; one day, users might be able to summon a self-driving vehicle or borrow a Ford-made bike. "People spend about 4.5 hours per year in a dealership, but they spend 900 hours per year being mobile. So how can we have an ongoing dialogue?" Elena Ford said. — AP

CISCO OUTLINES IT THREATS, SECURITY SOLUTIONS

KUWAIT: Cisco Kuwait participated in a security conference and exhibition at Raddison Blu Hotel under the patronage of the Central Department for Information Technology on May 11 and 12. Cisco General Manger Samer Al-Lahham spoke on the security threats and Cisco's emphasis on integrated security solutions that concentrate on threats. Cisco's annual security report estimates the cost of cybercrime for the business sector at \$2.1 trillion by 2019, which is nearly four times the estimate in 2015.

Lahham said the Central Department for Information Technology is working through Kuwait's information network to help government establishments and the nongovernment sector on exchanging information in a more secure form and at a lesser cost for government operations. The dire need in the near future is represented in companies benefiting from digital technologies without ignoring the security of sensitive data, he said.

Cisco concentrates on fulfilling the principle of security everywhere to implement it in data centers, Internet of Things and establishment networks including wireless ones, as it defends the infrastructure of information technology before, during and after an attack, and allows the establishment to focus on developing its business

Lahham spoke to Kuwait Times about three aspects of interest for those who are concerned about data, whether individuals or companies.

The first is the current infrastructure of companies and establishments, and there are many studies that show that 31 percent of Cisco customers' networks and their systems do not avail of maintenance services Cisco presents, and from this study we found out that 92 percent of systems have the probability of being exposed to electronic attacks.

The second aspect is the rapid development taking place, and there are nearly 10 billion systems linked to the Internet currently, and will reach 50 billion in the coming five years. The Internet is now in every part of our life such as health services, industries and almost everything, so this opens piracy windows that did not exist.

The third aspect is the huge development in video and use of multimedia. Prevalence of videos in the Middle East will increase by 71 percent, and all these aspects together make us deal with information security

in a totally different manner.

As for obstacles, Lahham said there are three main elements. The first is that there is a comprehensive plan to protect information in any company, and the plan must be activated with all employees. The second ele-

ment is the human factor, which must be trained on information security because this element is what operates this technology. The third element is what Cisco presents in solutions to all companies in the form of training the human element.

ARMED WITH DRONES, AID WORKERS SEEK FASTER RESPONSE TO EARTHQUAKES, FLOODS

KATHMANDU: For weeks after Nepal's worst earthquake in 80 years, the skies above the Himalayan nation vibrated with military helicopters ferrying relief, airplanes bringing in aid workers, and drones.

When the 7.8 magnitude quake struck Nepal in April 2015, flattening homes and killing thousands of people, authorities scrambled to assess the damage and deliver relief to survivors. Within hours foreign governments and aid agencies had heeded the overwhelmed Nepali government's appeal for assistance, sending everything from medical equipment to plastic sheets, food rations and clean water.

They also sent drones.

Long associated with conflicts where they have been deployed in air strikes and for intelligence or surveillance purposes, the use of Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAVs) is rising in other areas, including response to natural disasters.

In Nepal, several agencies used them for search and rescue missions and to map out toppled monuments, ruined heritage sites and devastated homes. The International Organization for Migration has been using drones since 2012 to capture the damage in Haiti after its 2010 earthquake.

Drones were again used in the Philippines after Typhoon Haiyan in 2013 as a tool for reconstruction efforts, and are now being deployed there to find out where farmland is most at risk from natural disasters, and to assess their impact.

In 2014, Medecins Sans Frontieres piloted the use of drones to deliver vaccines and medicine in Papua New Guinea, while the World Health Organization trailed a similar program in Bhutan, researchers said. "The beauty of drones is that they are cheap, easy to use and people can be taught to use them quickly, so there is no need for foreign aid workers to parachute into disaster zones," said Faine Greenwood, research assistant on drones at the Harvard Humanitarian Initiative.

An added burden?

With an ability to produce 3-D maps that are often more detailed than satellite imagery, drones can rapidly provide valuable information on the humanitarian needs of survivors.

While supporters of the technology hail its potential to revolutionize humanitarian work, industry experts warn of the security, ethical and legal concerns it raises for agencies and governments. For example in Nepal, media reports of drones flying near security installations stoked fears the footage could be misused.

Nepal had no regulations on drones when dis-

aster struck, leading to confusion within the government and aid agencies on how they should use the technology, said Patrick Meier, founder of humanitarian UAV network UAViators.

Such problems are the impetus behind a global code of conduct for using drones in aid that Meier hopes to launch at the World Humanitarian Summit in Istanbul later this month.

After the Nepal quake, the authorities said unregulated drones were an extra headache for an overstretched government already under fire for its slow and inadequate response to the disaster. "Drones were an added burden for us," Yadav Koirala, a senior official with Nepal's Home Ministry, told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "There was no restriction on them." "They flew everywhere but offered no feedback to the government. It was difficult to control them," he said.

As a result, the Civil Aviation Authority of Nepal banned UAVs from flying without its permission, restricted flying time to 15 minutes and introduced no-fly zones over houses, security agency buildings and religious or cultural heritage sites. It also stipulated that drones could only be used 300 meters from the pilot, and at a maximum flight height of 100 meters. - Reuters

CITIZEN-SCIENTISTS: US GOVT WANTS YOU TO FIGHT ZIKA!

Zika are already buzzing among us. The US government could use some help figuring out exactly where.

No experience is necessary for what the US Department of Agriculture envisions as a nationwide experiment in citizen-science. Teenagers already have proven themselves up to the task in tryouts involving a small number of high school students and science teachers. Now it's time for the Invasive Mosquito Project to scale up and fast, since Zika has been linked to serious birth defects and health officials are preparing for the possibility of small outbreaks in the United States. But there's little money in government budgets to track its spread.

"We don't have a lot of data - good, solid data," said John-Paul Mutebi, an entomologist with the US Centers for Disease Control. What the USDA is proposing is the kind of population survey not seen in the continental United States since World War II, when the country eradicated mosquito-borne viruses. In a 1945 film, the US government encouraged schoolkids and scout troops to do their part in keeping their neighborhoods free from dengue and yellow fever.

Volunteers now are needed to collect mosquito eggs in their communities and upload the data to populate an online

MIAMI: The mosquitoes that can spread map, which in turn will provide real-time information about hot spots to help researchers and mosquito controllers respond. Some local surveys have been revived as dengue fever and other viruses creep back into the country, carried in the blood of travelers and transmitted through mosquito bites. But that data hasn't been centralized, and the gaps are clear to CDC researchers, whose national maps only roughly show the possible spread of two disease-carrying mosquitoes.

cal reports, recent research and surveys sent in February to mosquito control districts nationwide, but evidence remains thin for habitat estimates. They suspect that Aedes aegypti could carry Zika well beyond the Southeast during the summer, and the more cold-hardy Asian tiger mosquito could be biting into the Midwest and Northeast.

Both species are capable of spreading Zika, but experts have considered the Asian tiger less of a threat for triggering outbreaks than the Aedes aegypti. The Invasive Mosquito Project is coordinated by Kansas-based USDA entomologist Lee Cohnstaedt, who has explored crowdsourcing as a budget-conscious way to sample mosquito populations and cites research supporting volunteers' capabilities for collecting large-scale data. Now

he's pinning his hopes for consistent data collection on students needing to do their homework, year after year.

He's thinking big: Participation from a fifth of US schools. Adapting lesson plans for middle schools, scout troops and gardening clubs. Making mosquito surveys as common as public bird counts for conservation groups. Turning classroom routines into a life-long habit of mosquito vigilance.

Since high school biology teacher Noah Busch incorporated the USDA project into his lesson plans, his students in Manhattan, Kansas, have made the connection between news reports about Zika and the mosquito traps they set near tires or backyard swimming pools.

"I had more parents afraid of this project than any of my students," said Busch, who teaches protocols for avoiding bites.

"The parents were thinking we were attracting mosquitoes. No, the mosquitoes are already there."

The equipment is nothing more than brown paper towels and dark-colored plastic party cups. Students insert the paper into the cups, fill the cups two-thirds of the way with water and place the cups around their homes. After about a week, they dry the towels and examine them for eggs, which look like tiny specks of dirt. Classes verify their findings with the USDA, local researchers or mosquito control officials before uploading their results to the project's website, which is part of a new central database for all federal citizen science activities.

In the past, Cohnstaedt could spend \$150 or more a night to send one employee to trap mosquitoes. Crowdsourcing that effort has "saved a bunch" of money and "collected better data than we could have working alone," he said in an email.

The Florida Keys Mosquito Control District wants the USDA project in three high schools this fall. The narrow island chain shares a national need for early warnings about invasions by Asian tiger mosquitoes or other species, executive director Michael Doyle said. "Having these collections on different islands will alert us to any additional places where it's trying to expand," Doyle said. — AP

NEW UN CLIMATE TALKS AIM AT FLESHING OUT PARIS DEAL

DIPLOMATS EYE POLITICAL BLUEPRINT INTO WORKABLE PLAN

BONN: Five months after ushering in a landmark climate deal, diplomats kicked off a new round of talks vesterday tasked with converting a political blueprint into a workable plan.

"The whole world is united in its commitment to the global goals embodied in the Paris Agreement," the UN's outgoing climate chief, Christiana Figueres, told the 196-nation UN climate body at the start of a 10-day session in Bonn. "Now we must design the details of the path to the safe, prosperous and climate neutral future to which we all aspire." That remains a daunting task, negotiators and experts agreed. The targets set are hugely ambitious, and the rift between rich and developing countries-overcome to seal the deal in December-remains just beneath the surface. The goal of capping global warming at "well below" two degree Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit) means nothing less than weaning the world economy off fossil fuels within a few short decades.

It will also require mobilizing trillions of dollars to help poor countries green their economies and brace for climate impacts. Most of the details on how this will happen have yet to be worked out.

Voluntary national pledges in the Paris pact to slash carbon pollution-going into effect in 2020 would still allow Earth's surface by at least 3 C (5.4 F), a cataclysmic scenario, say scientists. A single degree Celsius of warming since the pre-industrial benchmark has already seen a crescendo of devastating storms, droughts and rising seas.

Hottest April

US national scientists said over the weekend that last month was the warmest April recordedthe seventh consecutive month to exceed previous highs. "The only question is whether we join together quickly and boldly enough to avoid catastrophe," Thorig Ibrahim, environment minister for the Maldives and chair of the Alliance of Small Island States (AOSIS) told the plenary.

One of the UN body's most urgent tasks is orchestrating the ramping up of national plans to cut carbon pollution.

At the same time, the developing world is concerned that too little of the 100 billion dollars (88 billion euros) per year promised by wealthy nations starting in 2020 will go to dealing with climate impacts, rather than measures to curb greenhouse gases. "For our endeavours to be achieved, enhanced and adequate financial and technology support ... must be provided," a Thai diplomat, speaking for the 134-nation 'G77 and China' bloc said at the opening plenary. The early ratification of the Paris Agreement-likely for early next year would help push the UN forum to flesh out the rules and procedures needed to move forward, experts say.

"There is a lot of work to be done before 2020 to give life to those commitments that were made in Paris," said Alden Meyer, a climate analyst with the Washington-based Union of Concerned Scientists. Political leaders also encouraged the negotiators toward a shift in thinking. "As of now, you are no longer just negotiators, you are also builders," French environment minister Segolene Royal-current co-chair, along with her Moroccan counterpart, of the negotiating process-told diplomats. The UN climate talks run through May 26, and are also tasked with laying the groundwork for the next high-level gathering in November, in the Moroccan city of Marrakesh. — AFP

DIAGNOSIS TO SURVIVORSHIP



As the story spread, Taipei Zoo insisted Tuan Tuan and his fellow pandas were very

"Haha, in the future history will report that China attacked Taiwan because of a panda," one message on the Apple Daily website said. Another speculated that pro-independence groups would have been blamed for the panda's death. Although a full-fledged democracy, Taiwan has never formally declared a breakaway from China. Taiwanese pro-independence groups criticized the Ma government for accepting Tuan Tuan and Yuan Yuan in 2008, saying they were part of Beijing's proreunification push.

But political scepticism did not taint public acceptance and they became a star attraction. Panda-mania swept Taiwan again after the pair produced cub Yuan Zai in 2014, following a series of artificial insemination sessions. — AFP

'It's an uplifting place'

Jo Moore, 80, had Melanoma 25 years ago and was diagnosed with colon cancer three years ago. After her doctor removed the mass, he suggested she go to the Helen G. Nassif Community Cancer Center of Iowa, at the Physicians' Clinic of Iowa.

She met with an oncology-certified dietitian and goes weekly to a Tai Chi class with other cancer survivors and patients. She's changed her diet, she said, from her Missouri-deep-fried roots to one that includes more vegetable and fewer potatoes. The exercise group supports one another, she said they ask one another about children, grandchildren, oncology appointments and treatment.

"I look forward to it," Moore said. "It's an uplifting place."The community cancer center began offering its cancer wellness program in 2008, after Jane Borg of Cedar Rapids lost her battle with breast cancer. Her family donated the initial gift to start the program, said Nancy Hagensick, an oncology social worker. "She lived longer with cancer than what people expected - she worked at wellness, nutrition and exercise," Hagensick said.

The community cancer center works with cancer exercise specialists, massage therapists, reflexology professionals, a certified sex therapist and bodyimage specialist, and psychologists to work with patients, she added.

Family and caregiver are able to access all services as well, and St. Luke's offers a quarterly retreat for caregivers. Hagensick said there are many times she'll go to a patient's chemo therapy appointment to talk with them, and the patient suggests she instead speak to a spouse or family member attending the appointment instead. "We want to provide emotional support during and after treatment," Hagensick said. "There are changes to the body and your outlook on life changes." — AP

The 1- to 3-inch-long crabs have washed up for several years along the Orange County coastline. Before that, they hadn't been seen in the area for decades. - AP

WOMEN'S HEALTH - FROM MATERNAL MORTALITY TO CHILD MARRIAGE

COPENHAGEN: Over 5,000 delegates from 150 countries arrive in Copenhagen this week for Women Deliver - a major global conference on the health, rights and wellbeing of women and girls which runs from May 16-19. Here are some facts:

Maternal mortality: Every two minutes a woman dies from pregnancy related complications - a leading cause of death for teenage girls in developing countries. Ninety nine percent of maternal deaths occur in developing countries.

Newborn mortality: Nearly 3 million newborns die every year. Motherless children are up to 10 times more likely to die within two years of their mother's death. When women space their births by at least three years, newborns are twice as likely to survive their first year.

Child marriage: Every year 15 million girls marry before the age of 18 - one girl every two seconds. More than a third of the 700 million women worldwide who were married as children were wed before 15. Girls who give birth when they are under 15 are five times more likely to die in childbirth than young women in their 20s.

Family planning: 225 million women in developing countries have an unmet need for family planning. This leads to 74 million unplanned pregnancies, 28 million unplanned births and 26 million abortions every year. HIV/AIDS: Young women make up more than 60 percent of all young people living with HIV, or 72 percent in sub-Saharan Africa.

Female genital mutilation: At least 200 million girls and women have undergone FGM in 30 countries across three continents. FGM causes a host of health problems including potentially fatal childbirth complications later in life.

Fistula: More than 2 million women are estimated to be living with fistula, one of the most serious childbirth injuries, and some 50,000 to 100,000 new cases develop annually. Obstetric fistula is a hole between the birth canal and bladder or rectum caused by prolonged, obstructed labour without treatment.

Violence: One in four women is physically abused during pregnancy. In some countries, nearly half of girls report their first sexual encounter was coerced. — Reuters


VENUS

Venus is the second planet from the Sun, orbiting it every 224.7 Earth days. It has the longest rotation period (243 days) of any planet in the Solar System and rotates in the opposite direction to most other planets. It has no natural satellite. It is named after the Roman goddess of love and beauty. It is the second-brightest natural object in the night sky after the Moon, reaching an apparent magnitude of 4.6 bright enough

tude of - 4.6, bright enough to cast shadows. Because Venus is an inferior planet from Earth, it never appears to venture far from the Sun; its elongation reaches a maximum of 47.8∞.

Venus is a terrestrial planet and is sometimes called Earth's "sister planet" because of their similar size, mass, proximity to the Sun, and bulk composition. It is radically different from Earth in other respects. It has the densest atmosphere

of the four terrestrial planets, consisting of more than 96% carbon dioxide. The atmospheric pressure at the planet's surface is 92 times that of Earth. Venus is by far the hottest planet in the Solar System, with a mean surface temperature of 735 K (462 ∞ C; 863 ∞ F), even though Mercury is closer to the Sun. Venus is shrouded by an opaque layer of highly reflective clouds of sulfuric acid, preventing its surface from being seen from space in visible light. It may have had water oceans in the past, but



these would have vaporized as the temperature rose

objects in the sky, Venus has been a major fixture in human culture for as long as records have existed. It has been made sacred to gods of many cultures, and has been a prime inspiration for writers and poets as the "morning star" and "evening star". Venus was the first planet to have its motions plotted across the sky, as early as the second millennium BC, and was a prime target for early interplanetary exploration as

the closest planet to Earth. It was the first planet beyond Earth visited by a spacecraft (Mariner 2) in 1962, and the first to be successfully landed on (by Venera 7) in 1970. Venus's thick clouds render observation of its surface impossible in visible light, and the first detailed maps did not emerge until the arrival of the Magellan orbiter in 1991. Plans have been proposed for rovers or more complex missions, but they are hindered by Venus's hostile surface conditions. English to from Yucatec Maya was a large pre-Columbian city built by the Maya people of the Terminal Classic period. The archaeological site is located in Tinum Municipality, Yucata State, Mexico.

Chichen Itza was a major focal point in the Northern Maya Lowlands from the Late Classic (c. AD 600-900) through the Terminal Classic (c. AD 800-900) and into the early portion of the Post classic period (c. AD 900-1200). The site exhibits a multitude of architectural styles, reminiscent of styles seen in central Mexico and of the Puuc and Chenes styles of the Northern Maya lowlands. The presence of central Mexican styles was once thought to have been representative of direct migration or even conquest from central Mexico, but most contemporary interpretations view the presence of these non-Maya styles more as the result of cultural diffusion.

Chichen Itza was one of the largest Maya cities and it was likely to have been one of the mythical great cities, or Tollans, referred to in later Mesoamerican literature. The city may have had the most diverse population in the Maya world, a factor that could have contributed to the variety of architectural styles at the site.

The ruins of Chichen Itza are federal property, and the site's stewardship is maintained by Mexico's Instituto Nacional de Antropologia e Historia (National Institute of Anthropology and History). The land under the monuments had been privately owned until 29 March 2010, when it was purchased by the state of Yucatan. Chichen Itza is one of the most visited archaeological sites in Mexico; an estimated 1.4 million tourists visit the ruins every year.

Chichen Itza is located in the eastern portion of Yucatan state in Mexico. The northern Yucatan Peninsula is arid, and the rivers in the interior all run underground. There are two large, natural sink holes, called cenotes, that could have provided plentiful water year round at Chichen, making it attractive for settlement. Of the two cenotes, the "Cenote Sagrado" or Sacred Cenote (also variously known as the Sacred Well or Well of Sacrifice), is the most famous.

According to post-Conquest sources (Maya and Spanish), pre-Columbian Maya sacrificed objects and human beings into the cenote as a form of worship to the Maya rain god Chaac. Edward Herbert Thompson dredged the Cenote Sagrado from 1904 to 1910, and recovered artifacts of gold, jade, pottery and incense, as well as human remains. A study of human remains taken from the Cenote Sagrado found that they had wounds consistent with human sacrifice.

What was its economic standards?

Chichen Itza was a major economic power in the northern Maya lowlands during its apogee. Participating in the water-borne circum-peninsular trade route through its port site of Isla Cerritos on the north coast, Chichen Itza was able to obtain locally unavailable resources from distant areas such as obsidian from central Mexico and gold from southern Central America.

Between AD 900 and 1050 Chichen Itza expanded to become a powerful regional capital controlling north and central Yucatan. It established Isla Cerritos as a trading port.

Cannes film shines light on Chad's 'torture factories'

about the survivors of Chadian dictator Hissene Habre's torture chambers, when one of the torturers kneels down in front of his victim and begs for forgiveness. "I had to follow orders," mumbles "Mahamat the Cameroonian"-now a broken man himself living on the streets as an outcast. "Then why did you have to beat me so badly?" his victim asks, handing the former gendarme the rubber pipe he used to flail his prisoner's leg to a pulp.

"Your superiors told you to stop, but you went on and on," adds the man, who lost the leg. The scene is typical of the muted but unflinching encounters that fill "Hissein Habre, A

Chadian Tragedy", Mahamat-Saleh Haroun's quietly dignified film about one of Africa's least known mass killings, which premieres at the Cannes film festival yesterday. Some 40,000 people were murdered during Habre's eight-year reign of terror, a Chadian commission concluded, while the West looked the other way, more worried about the Cold War and Moamer Kadhafi in neighboring Libya.

Habre was their ally and American and French money even paid for the country's political police, the feared DDS, to torture on an industrial scale, said Clement Abaifouta, who leads a survivors' group in the capital N'Djamena.

Habre verdict

The group has spent 15 years trying to bring the former rebel leader-who was deposed in 1990 — to trial. Habre will



Interesting the second s Second sec neighboring Senegal, where he had fled into exile. One of the victims featured in the film, Adimatcho Djamai, who was tortured so badly he spent more than two decades on the flat of his back in a corrugated iron shack, died the day he was due to testify at Habre's trial. Haroun told AFP he wanted to cast a light on what he calls "this genocide" largely ignored by the outside world "because it was some business of the blacks" carried out behind closed doors.

The director uses Abaifouta as his narrator, visiting his fellow survivors and gently coaxing the horrific stories of their torture from them. A hugely cultured man, he was chosen by the guards to bury those who died around him in the packed cells from hunger, thirst and torture.

Forgiveness

Sometimes he would wake to find another inmate dead beside him and "be glad that it meant a little more space. That is what we were reduced to" he said. "We were beasts." "I had to pull my life together with a rake" afterwards, he said. Haroun said most of the people who were rounded up by Habre's DDS henchmen "were innocent. They were arrested for no reason, the random victims of a bloodthirsty regime." One, Robert Gambier, trying to explain the terrible things done to them, thought Habre might have wanted to appease the spirits with human "sacrifice so he could hold onto power".


Haroun-Chad's foremost filmmaker whose film "Grigris" competed for the Palme d'Or at Cannes in 2013 — told AFP he wanted to see "if was it possible to still live together after such monstrosities. Can survivors still find a place for forgiveness in their hearts?"

While "Mahamat the Cameroonian" is forgiven by his victim, another survivor Haroun filmed was convinced his former torturer would one day try to murder him so he wouldn't have to see pass him in the street again. Asked by Abaifouta if he would kill the man if he had the chance, he said he would.

While the victims pray that Habre will be punished by the judges in Dakar, they are under no illusions that it will make their pain any more bearable. One man who was once rich enough to have five wives said he was now a "vegetable", his brain shrunk by the lack of vitamins while in jail. "Only one of the wives has staved." For those who still have their minds, the torture continues in the memories they carry. "I carry the dead around my head like a turban," one said.—AFP

Drake beats Radiohead to top US chart

rake ruled the US album sales chart for a second straight week Sunday as the rap star who has smashed streaming records fended off challenges from Beyonce and Radiohead. The Canadian rapper's "Views," which came

Striking Singapore death penalty film stirs emotions at Cannes

Defore he made his new film about the death penalty, Boo Junfeng sat down to tea with some of Singapore's Disco Junieng sat down to tea what source and retired hangmen. He also talked to the priests and imams who helped condemned prisoners make their last walk to the gallows. And most difficult of all, the young filmmaker spent years trying to reach through the curtain of shame to families who had lost fathers and sons to the hangman's rope.

But it was only after Boo, whose film premieres at the Cannes film festival yesterday, met one particularly "humane" executioner that he had an epiphany. He realized that no movie has ever dealt with the whole horrible business from the perspective of the man who pulls the lever. "I had already started to write (the film) but after I met the first hangman I couldn't write for three months. What completely threw me was how much I enjoyed his company," said Boo.

"He was not like I thought. He was likeable, charismatic, grandfatherly jocular and open about what he did. He took pride in the almost caring way he looked after the prisoners trying to make it as humane as he could, and I realized how difficult that was. "He really shook up my ideas and forced me to rethink everything." So Boo took his film-which he toiled over for five years-one step further. For "Apprentice" has a shocking twist. It is the story of a young man who ended up learning the executioner's trade from the man who opened the trapdoor on his own father.



'Jolly hangman'

More surprising still is the intensity of the almost father-son relationship that develops between the young prison guard and the hangman. "He is in some ways searching for his father," Boo said. "And in doing that he finds this man. What I was going for was human truth. I didn't want to make it an activist film." The death penalty is nevertheless a hot political issue in Singapore and in neighboring Indonesia, particularly when foreigners have fallen foul of strict anti-drug smuggling laws.

The execution of seven foreigners in Bali last year-including two Australians and a mentally ill Brazilian-sparked an international outcry, and several others, including a British woman and a Frenchman, are still on death row there. Boo said he began his research with the book "Once a Jolly Hangman" which features Darshan Singh, Singapore's chief executioner for nearly 50 years who once executed 18 men in one day.

Author jailed

Its British author Alan Shadrake was arrested the morning after the book's Singapore launch in 2010 and was held for a month in Changi prison for insulting the country's judiciary. He had criticized the way he claimed the death penalty was disproportionately applied to the poor, while well-connected criminals and wealthy foreigners escaped the noose. Boo shot the prison scenes in disused prisons in Australia to avoid controversy in the tiny city state, where an estimated 95 percent of the population still support the death penalty.

"It would have been easy to make a film about the death penalty itself, but it's much bigger than that. I learned so

out on April 29, became the first album released in 2016 to sell more than one million copies in the United States, tracking service Nielsen Music said. "Views" sold 219,000 copies during the week through Thursday, 175,000 in direct sales and the rest through the equivalent in streaming.

Pop superstar Beyonce's "Lemonade," which was released on April 23, came second while English experimental rockers Radiohead's "A Moon Shaped Pool" debuted at number three on the Billboard chart. In its first week, "Views" had set a record for the most-ever streams in the seven-day period. Despite the rapid growth of streaming in the music industry, none of the top three albums appeared on the most popular site, Spotify. Apple reached an exclusive deal to distribute "Views" on its Apple Music streaming service and the album was also available for purchase on the tech giant's iTunes store.

"Views" became available to rival streaming services on Friday, too late to factor on the latest weekly chart. Beyonce in turn made "Lemonade" an exclusive to the smaller Tidal service, which is led by her husband, rap mogul Jay-Z. She has shunned Spotify but "Lemonade," which debuted at number one, quickly went up for sale on iTunes and, as of May 6, on CD. Radiohead frontman Thom Yorke is an outspoken critic of the compensation structure of Spotify, which unlike most streaming services has a free tier.

much about the value of human life" from making the movie. Boo, 32, one of a new wave of talented Singapore filmmakers, said his friends who are against the death penalty "may be disappointed by the film", which is showing in the Certain Regard section at Cannes. "I took myself out of the comfort zone to address the issue from a different point of view. I don't have a view myself (in the film). Because the humanity behind the issue is so much more complex," said Boo, whose semi-autobiographical first feature "Sandcastle" was a hit at the French festival in 2009.



Rapper Azealia Banks apologizes for racist rant on Zayn


racist and Islamophobic invective against former One Direction heartthrob Zayn Malik that led Twitter to suspend her. Banks, who has long been notorious for provocative social media postings and has rarely voiced remorse, offered her "sincerest apologies to the world" in a posting on Instagram, where her account remains active. "Employing racial/sexual slurs/stereotypes in attempts to make fun of or degrade another person or group is not fair or fun for anyone," wrote Banks, who performed Sunday in Istanbul.

"Allowing my anger to get the best of me, I've managed to insult millions of people without reason. And for that I give my deepest apologies," she wrote late Saturday. Banks, who is African American, used a series of epithets targeting Muslims in a rant on Twitter late Tuesday against Zayn, whom she accused of copying her style in his new racy look after One Direction. Banks on one point gloated that the US military would kill the family of Zayn, a Briton who is partially of



Twitter suspended her account on Thursday, pointing to its policy against "abusive tweets and behavior." Banks initially defended herself, suggesting that she was singled out as an African American woman and saying she was upset that Zaynwho has gone only by his first name since leaving the boy band-refused to engage with her over her criticism. Banks, who did not mention Zayn by name in her apology, also clarified one point from her insults-she had no problem with curry, one of the terms she used to berate him.

She said she was repeating a joke from her native New York-where nearly half of cab drivers were born in Bangladesh, among minorities. — AFP

Red Hot Chili Peppers cancel shows as singer hospitalized

he Red Hot Chili Peppers on Sunday canceled a second show after abruptly scrapping a concert as frontman Anthony Kiedis was rushed to the hospital for intestinal flu. The alternative rock greats had been due to headline Saturday's annual Weenie Roast concert held by radio station KROQ near the band's native Los Angeles. But the band took the stage without their instruments as bassist Flea apologetically told the crowd that Kiedis was on his way to the hospital due to stomach pains. "We are unable to play tonight. We will be playing for you very soon and we will play for you like the feral animals full of love that we are," Flea said, according to video footage posted by a spectator.

"We are so sorry," added Flea, appearing topless as is often his wont. Weezer, another band that built a following during the 1990s alternative rock boom, instead became the headliner of the concert. The Chili Peppers in a statement Sunday explained that Kiedis had been hospitalized for "complications from the intestinal flu" and was "expected to make a full recovery soon." The band, however, canceled its next show which was scheduled for today in Los Angeles.

The Red Hot Chili Peppers have an active touring schedule ahead of them as they prepare to release "The Getaway," their first album in five years, on June 17. Upcoming dates including appearances at major international festivals including Japan's Fuji Rock, Roskilde in Denmark, Reading and Leeds in Britain and the 25th anniversary of Lollapalooza in Chicago. The Chili Peppers rose to fame in the late 1980s as they brought an element of funk, especially through Flea's distinctive bass, to hard rock, with lyricism by Kiedis that ranged from dark tales of drug use to the ironic. — AFP



'Soviet chic' restaurant favored



by KGB spies reopens in Moscow

Monoposition of the spies and cosmonauts, has reopened with its Soviet-era grandeur restored. The high-end eatery on the main Tverskaya street, which opened in 1938 at the height of Stalin's purges, has relaunched under the same name after a \$20 million (17 million euros) restoration. The restaurant opened on the initiative of Stalin's notorious security chief Lavrenty Beria for the use of officials from his NKVD agency, the Soviet secret service later renamed the KGB.

It grew popular with other officials and later in the 1960s under Nikita Khrushchev, in the so-called "Thaw" period when censorship and repression eased, lured a more bohemian crowd of artists and actors. Aragvi was immortalized in Soviet literature and featured in films, although its sky-high prices made it accessible only to a tiny elite. Diners had to pay a tenth of the average monthly wage for the privilege of eating alongside artists, cosmonauts, filmmakers and chess champions. "In the Soviet Union, dropping a mention of the famous Aragvi chicken-which was grilled with nuts and garlic-gained you entry into the creme de la creme of society," said one former diner, Nelli Maximova, an 83-yearold retired translator.

"And it was really delicious, their chicken." In 1943, poet Sergei Mikhalkov was in the restaurant when he came up with the idea of writing the lyrics for the new Soviet national anthem, praising Stalin for inspiring "great deeds." After the fall of the Soviet Union in 1991, the state-owned restaurant was privatized and changed hands several times, but it rapidly lost its cachet and finally closed down in 2003. Its new owners, Tashir group and Gor Nakhapetyan, who previously led the Troika Dialog investment group, have spent more than \$20 million restoring the restaurant, saying they want to revive a Soviet legend.

"Of course we wanted to revive nostalgia for a bygone era," Nakhapetian, who grew up in ex-Soviet Armenia, told AFP. The new menu includes the classic Georgian dishes that made its reputation such as khinkali (dumplings full of meat and bouillon) and khachapuri, bread topped with cheese, as well as non-Georgian specialties such as borscht and Black Sea herring pate. Hearty Georgian fare from a region wedged between Europe, Russia, Asia and the Middle East, is hugely popular in Russia, although it is usually more affordable than in Aragvi. from Tbilisi. The restaurant is named after a Georgian river is located inside a former hotel where Leo Tolstoy and Anton Chekhov once stayed. Its main dining rooms are painted in the grand Soviet manner, with sheaves of corn, tractors and beaming workers, particularly the room once reserved for the use of Beria. In the Stalin era, the restaurant had its most important ingredients, particularly those for its famous "satsivi" or cold chicken in nut sauce, delivered in a special train carriage



from Tbilisi. Under Stalin, an ethnic Georgian, "Georgian food was served at the Kremlin and was seen as the cuisine of the Soviet 'tsars," said Leonid Parfyonov, a television host who has written numerous books about everyday life in the Soviet Union. Even after Stalin's death, "in the context of the bleak Soviet culinary scene, the Georgian tradition of wines and spices brought a breath of joie de vivre, and Aragvi was a symbol of Soviet chic," Parfyonov said.

Recruiting agents

Yet Aragvi also had a more sinister side. It was a hangout for KGB officers who used it as a spot to recruit agents and its dining rooms were wired up with hidden microphones. "For the KGB, Aragvi was always the favorite place to recruit agents and for farewell parties for agents going abroad," said Mikhail Lyubimov, who long headed the KGB's operations against Britain and Scandinavian countries and is now a writer. In 1960, he recalled his KGB boss sent him to Aragvi to informally meet the new number two of his department.

On another evening "with plenty of drinking, one of our men invited a beautiful woman to dance, not realizing she herself was a US spy and was being tailed by the KGB," he said, laughing. "The front-of-house staff there were mainly retired KGB officers-and the food was sublime," Lyubimov said. In the reopened restaurant, the guestbook is full of nostalgic messages, with diners appealing: "Bring back the old recipes" and "Marinade the meat like you used to do."

Marina Dolgikh, a 49-year-old lawyer, leafed through the menu, saying that she had popped in out of curiosity since she knew of the original restaurant. Main courses are priced at around 900 to 1,700 rubles (\$12.5 to \$27, 11 to 24 euros) — a range that would not be out of place in many western capitals today but a tough stretch for middle-class Moscovites. "In its time, Aragvi was inaccessible to me," she said, adding glumly after looking at the prices: "And it's still out of my budget."— AFP
