SAUDIA PILOT TRIGGERS FALSE HIJACK ALARM

MANILA: A pilot of a Saudi Arabian Airlines flight accidentally pressed a hijack alarm and triggered a major security response at Manila airport yesterday, authorities said. Police isolated and surrounded the Saudia flight after it landed yesterday afternoon just after one of its pilots issued a distress signal indicating a hijack was underway, the Philippine aviation authority said in a statement. Hundreds of passengers aboard the Boeing 777 flight from the Red Sea city of Jeddah were forced to remain on the plane for more than two hours, but were allowed to disembark about 5:00 pm (0900 GMT) after it was confirmed there was no threat.

Soon after the distress signal was activated, authorities at Manila control tower obtained a verbal confirmation from the pilot that he had triggered it although he did not say why at the time, Manila airport aviation security chief Mao Aplasca told reporters. "It was only after the plane was parked for some time that he said it was a false alarm," Aplasca added. In Saudi Arabia, an airline spokesman also told AFP there was no security threat. "False alarm for hijack for Flight 872," the spokesman said.

The Philippines' aviation authority said in a statement the distress signal pressed by the pilot alerted authorities "that a hijacking incident is on progress on board". "Immediately the flight was given priority landing by airport authorities... and was directed to park on the remote bay and isolated for security procedures," the statement said. "Apparently the pilot committed an error activating the 7500 squawking signal," the statement said, referring to the hijack alarm.

KUWAIT: MP Ahmad Al-Qudhaibi said yesterday that the government has succeeded in "aborting" an emergency session of the National Assembly that was due to discuss the hike in petrol prices. The lawmaker said only 29 MPs signed the motion for the emergency session, just four members short of the required number to force the convening of the session.

The Assembly is currently on summer recess and cannot hold sessions unless an absolute


majority of its members sign a petition and the government agrees to attend the meeting. Qudhaibi charged that since he and other MPs started collecting signatures for the session, the government tried to evade because it knew that lawmakers would have debated all issues related to the main subject. He alleged that the government preferred to accept the grilling of the finance minister over the



emergency session because it is aware that during the grilling, only one MP will speak, while at the emergency session, all MPs would have covered a variety of issues.

Qudhaibi said during the session, MPs would have asked all the ministers to explain the achievements they made in diversifying the sources of income in the country. The lawmaker said that MPs would have also debated the grave violations committed by illegally sending a large number of patients for overseas treatment for political purposes.

Qudhaibi said MPs would have also held the justice minister to account for failing to issue the bylaws of the Anti-Corruption Authority seven months after publishing the law, although it clearly states that they must have been issued two months after the publication.

PROTEIN SHIELDING DNA FROM X-RAYS

PARIS: A protein unique to a miniscule creature called a water bear, reputedly the most indestructible animal on Earth, protects human DNA from X-ray damage, stunned researchers reported yesterday. Human cells cultivated with the newly-discovered protein, dubbed "Dsup" for "damage suppressor", experienced half as much decay as normal cells when blasted with radiation. "We were really surprised," said lead author Takuma Hashimoto, a biologist at the University of Tokyo who designed the experiments. "It is striking that a single gene is enough to improve the radiation tolerance of human cultured cells," he told AFP, referring to the tardigrade-derived protein.

Tardigrades, as the water bears are more prosaically known, have long fascinated scientists with their veritable superpowers of survival. Barely the size of a grain of sand, they look as if they escaped from a Star Trek sequel. Seemingly eyeless, they have bodies resembling hazmat suits, eight puffy legs with bear-like claws, and a vacuum-cleaner nozzle of a snout. Most eat moss and lichen. Some feed on other water bears. Remarkably, these primitive water-dwellers can withstand

OBAMA SLAMS STRONGMEN IN LAST UN ADDRESS

ANGELINA JOLIE FILES FOR DIVORCE FROM BRAD PITT

for divorce from Brad Pitt and is seeking custody of their six children, spelling the end for "Brangelina", one of Hollywood's highest-profile celebrity couples. The 41year-old Jolie filed legal documents on Monday citing irreconcilable differences with Pitt, 52, and listing their date of separation as Sept 15, according to entertainment news websites TMZ and People. "This decision was made for the health of the family," Jolie's attorney Robert Offer said in a statement circulated to US media. "She will not be commenting at this time, and asks that the

Two of the world's biggest stars, Pitt and Jolie formed a Hollywood power couple second to none, so famous they were known simply by their combined first names. The A-listers wed in France in August two years ago, but have been a couple since 2004 and have six children together, three of whom are adopted. Jolie is seeking physical custody of the children, with visiting rights for Pitt, according to TMZ, which said she was not seeking spousal support.

UNITED NATIONS: Barack Obama used his farewell UN address yesterday to castigate strongmen and populists, taking aim at Russia's Vladimir Putin and Donald Trump's rise at home. Obama told the UN General Assembly that democracy was a better path toward prosperity than the "crude populism" that is mushrooming in the United States and around the world. "Some argue the future favors the strong man," Obama said, in remarks sure to echo on the 2016 US campaign trail. "I believe this thinking is wrong. History shows that strong men are then left with two paths: Permanent crackdown, which sparks strife at home, or scapegoating enemies abroad, which can lead to war."

Obama's comments come amid a scorched-earth campaign to succeed him, which has seen a wave of popular

support for Republican Party nominee Trump, who holds far-right stances on immigration and national security. "Our country has been weak. We're letting people in by the thousands and tens of thousands," the businessman said Monday, attacking Obama. Obama challenged that thinking in his address at the UN, saying: "We have to open our hearts and do more to help refugees who are desperate for a home. We have to imagine what it would be like for our family, for our children if the unspeakable happened to us."

Obama admitted, however, that a "course correction" was needed to smooth the serrated edges of globalization and neutralize "alternative visions" promoted by populists and zealots.

Emirati seeks sex change

ABU DHABI: An Emirati woman has sought leave to have a sex change operation in what would be a first for the United Arab Emirates, newspapers reported yesterday. The application to the court in the UAE capital Abu Dhabi comes after a change in the law took effect earlier this month legalizing gender reassignment surgery. Lawyer Ali Al-Mansouri told Gulf News the 29-year-old woman always felt strongly that she was not the gender she physically appeared to be. He said his client's feeling that her body does not reflect her true gender caused her severe distress, anxiety and depression. "She has been undergoing physical and psychological care since 2012 and a medical commission had recommended that she undergo a sex-change surgery."

Qatar workers unpaid

DOHA: As many as 400 migrant staff working for an electrical company in Qatar have gone unpaid for up to four months, a leading figure in the Indian community said yesterday. The workers are set to meet the Indian ambassador in Doha within the next two weeks to discuss their plight, Arvin Patil of the Indian Community Benevolent Forum charity told AFP. The staff are thought to be employed by an Abu Dhabi-based firm. "Around 300 to 400 people have not been paid," said Patil, adding people from other migrant groups based in the emirate had also not been paid by the firm.

Gulf budget deficit peaks

KUWAIT: Gulf Arab oil exporters are expected to see their budget deficits peak this year owing to the plunge in energy revenues, a report said yesterday. The combined deficit of the six GCC states is forecast to hit \$153 billion in 2016, up from \$119 billion last year, Kuwait's investment firm KAMCO Research said. Saudi Arabia is expected to account for 55 percent, or more than \$84 billion, of the shortfall. The GCC deficit will start easing from next year but the six nations are forecast to post an average annual shortfall of \$100 billion until 2021. GCC total revenues dropped from a peak of \$735 billion in 2013 to just \$443 billion in 2015, the lowest in five years, KAMCO said. They are forecast to slide further to \$365 billion this year.

8 hurt in Saudi oil fire

RIYADH: Eight workers at the Saudi Arabian state oil company Saudi Aramco were injured in an oil terminal fire yesterday, the company said. There was no impact on operations at the Gulf coast Ras Tanura facility, Saudi Aramco said in a statement. Emergency services "successfully responded to a minor fire" at about 9:00 am (0600 GMT) and the blaze has been fully contained, it said. "Workers in the facility have been evacuated." The injured employees received medical treatment, and the cause of the fire is being investigated, Saudi Aramco said.



PETTY CORRUPTION IN KUWAIT ON THE RISE

uwait has faced a growing number of incidents of corruption in recent years. Most troubling about this trend is that the corruption has reached into the very smallest aspects of daily life, so that bribes and fraud are becoming almost common place at nearly every level. Two troubling issues that have come to our attention lately include a shady rental practice now flourishing in Kuwait and the robbing of expats by low level government officials.

In our first instance, it seems that some landlords (or their managers) are engaging in fraud when it comes to rental contracts. Any tenant that disputes a rental increase can file a case in the rental court. But what's happening now is perhaps a way to skirt the law. Some apartment managers are refusing to accept the rent or issue rental receipts until the tenant signs a contract for an amount far above the agreed upon rent. The way the scam works is this. Say a tenant and landlord agree to a rent of KD 250 for a two bedroom apartment. But when the contract is drawn up, the rental amount stated is KD 400. The tenant balks. But then the landlord or apartment manager explains that he will still accept the agreed upon KD 250 but give the tenant a receipt for KD 400.

Now some tenants will agree because they have few options or don't understand the law. But if they do agree, and accept a contract with a wrong amount, and receipts with a wrong amount, they will have no recourse when and if anytime in the future (before the legal five year period is up) the landlord demands the higher rent stated in the contract. Even if the landlord or haris never asks for the higher rent during the five vears, the tenant is still involved in a fraud. It has been suggested that some landlords and apartment managers try to use the higher rental contracts/receipts to take bank loans.

In the second instance, the Kuwait Times newspaper has received more than a few troubling reports of police officers, government officials and even some embassies taking cash from expats on the pretext of paying fines or other business. As in the Letter to the Editor we publish today, the situation is troubling because it represents a culture of petty corruption without consequences that a growing segment of society are involved in.

These may seem like small, unimportant instances especially when the country faces so many more pressing challenges. But petty corruption can have serious impacts on a nation's future and economic development. It can undermine a government's ability to execute public services, discourage foreign investment by tarnishing a country's reputation and harm chances for economic growth and diversification.

In 2016, corruption in Kuwait worsened significantly according to Transparency International. In its annual Corruption Perceptions Index published yesterday, the global corruption watchdog, ranked Kuwait 55 out of 167 countries, dropping it six places from last year's spot at 49. Oddly enough, petty corruption is mostly common in poor, impoverished countries and it's a telling sign of the problems facing Kuwait that such petty corruption is now happening here.

KUWAIT CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE

KUWAIT: Kuwait celebrates the International Day of Peace today, under the theme "The Sustainable Development Goals: Building Blocks for Peace." Kuwait has exerted huge efforts to achieve international peace and provide humanitarian aid for those in need, mainly after His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah became the leader of Kuwait in 2006. The UN's General Assembly has celebrated the peace day for the first time in 1982, declaring September 21st as a date of ceasing fire and stopping violence. Since becoming a UN member in 1963,

Kuwait has been supporting the organization's peace efforts around the world and play a vital role in resolving dispute between Arab countries. Kuwait hosted many summits and conferences aiming to end conflicts in the Arab World, mainly that between Egypt and Yemen during the Nasserism era. It also resolved the dispute between South and North Yemen on joint borders in 1972, which ended in the signing of a peace agreement after a visit of His Highness Sheikh Sabah AlAhmad, who was then the Foreign Minister of Kuwait.

Moreover, the country played an effective role in ending disputes between Jordan and Palestine in 1970, while also being a mediator in resolving issues between other Arab states by the end of the 60s. Another prominent achievement is His Highness' efforts when he headed talks that led to the signing of the Taif Agreement, bringing an end to the civil war in Lebanon in 1989. In the same context, Kuwait also hosted the UN-sponsored Yemeni peace talks last April to end the conflict in the country and achieve peace and security.

Meanwhile, the country is well known for its humanitarian work around the world, as it has provided several loans to Arab, African and Asian states even during the Iraqi Invasion in 1990. As part of its efforts to aid those in need, Kuwait announced establishing the Goodwill Fund with a \$100 million to face the world food crisis, during the first Arab Economic Summit it hosted in 2009. The country also hosted three donors conferences to improve humanitarian conditions in Syria, the

first was in 2013 where Kuwait pledged \$300 millions for Syrians and collected \$4.4 billions as international donations.

Kuwait also pledged \$500 million during the second conference in 2014, collecting \$2.4 million from international donations and finally pledging another \$500 million in the third event held in 2015, and collecting \$3.8 billion from participating countries. In recognition of Kuwait's efforts, the UN granted His Highness the Amir the "Humanitarian Leader" title and Kuwait a "Humanitarian Center" in 2014. Despite being a developing country, Kuwait is continuously providing loans and aid for other developing and less developed countries to support development projects. The rate of developmental aid granted by Kuwait exceeded 1.3 percent of the total GDP, which is above the international percentage agreed upon for aid.

According to a report released by a British organization for international development initiatives in 2014, Kuwait came in first place among Gulf states in providing humanitarian aid, and it was in the 14th place among the 20

most providing countries in the world, as the country's aid reached \$327 million. Kuwait depends on four main bodies in delivering humanitarian aid, including the Ministry of Finance, Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED), Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) and Zakat House. KFAED has provided about KD 2.4 billion of loans between 1990 to 2014 for countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and the Americas. The fund's aid and grants reached nearly KD 74 million in the same time period.

In the same context, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs said in a report that Kuwait's Ministry of Finance has provided about KD three billion for Arab countries between 1990 and 2014. It also gave about KD 6.7 billion for non-Arab countries. Speaking to KUNA yesterday, KRCS' Deputy Chairman Anwar Al-Hasawi said the society provided aid to over 67 countries since it was established in 1966. The aid included building schools, hospitals, reconstructing damaged houses and sending food and medicines. — KUNA

SHEIKH SABAH AL-KHALED ATTENDS SUMMIT ON PALESTINE ECONOMY

AMIR RENEWS KUWAIT'S COMMITMENT TO NAM PRINCIPLES

NEW YORK: Kuwait's First Deputy Premier and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah on Monday participated in a meeting of the Ad-Hoc Liaison Committee (AHLC) on Palestine economy (AHLC), held under the presidency of Norway. The AHLC aims at coordinating international assistance offered by donor countries to the Palestinian people. Participants in the meeting discussed economic and development challenges facing the Palestinian people, and reaffirmed the importance of providing all types of assistance for them. The meeting was attended by Assistant Foreign Minister for Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled's office Ambassador Sheikh Dr Ahmad Nasser Al-Sabah and Kuwait's permanent representative to the UN Mansour Al-Otaibi.

In another development, Kuwait has reaffirmed its commitment to the principles of the Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) that was founded more than half a century ago amid exceptional conditions, His Highness the Amir of Kuwait Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah said. The organization emerged at a time of polarization that marked the cold war era, he said in a speech delivered on his behalf by Kuwaiti Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah at the 17th NAM Summit.

The summit was held at the Island of Margarita, Venezuela, under the slogan of "United on the Path for Peace" with representa-

tives of more 160 countries taking part. His Highness the Amir said NAM asserted itself as an effective and influential grouping representing the developing world on the basis of shared interests and solidarity regardless of the geographical, ideological or ethnic boundaries. The Organization was able to reflect its noble principles and values on the ground at historic events and critical junctures, thus proving its ability to achieve cooperation among its member states and impact the new world order, he affirmed, noting that the NAM members account for nearly 55 percent of the total population of the world.

The tremendous challenges facing the world today, including the natural and man-made disasters, armed conflicts and human rights violations, require doubled efforts to restore peace and achieve sustainable development. Kuwait believes strongly in joint action to realize the 17 goals set forth the UN Sustainable Development Summit in the post-2015 development agenda on September 25-27, 2015, New York, His Highness the Amir went on.

He added that Kuwait's approach to development is comprehensive and covers the economic, social and environmental dimensions on the regional and international scales. Kuwait spares no effort in helping the developing countries through the development aid, offered by Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED), that accounted for 1.4 percent of the country's growth domestic product, he said, noting that this percentage is two times more that the internationally-agreed level.

His Highness the Amir cited as example the assistance offered by Kuwait to conflict-hit countries in the Arab world, notably sisterly Syria, Yemen and Irag.

Since the beginning of the crisis in Syria more than five years ago, Kuwait has hosted three international humanitarian pledging conferences for the country and contributed \$1.7 billion out of the total aid pledges that amounted to seven billion dollars, he added.

On Thursday, †Sept 15, 2016 at around 10:30 am, I was leaving for work in my vehicle. I had just finished changing the engine oil of my vehicle at the neighborhood garage and was still in the inner street when a policeman stopped me, asking for my driving license and registration. Upon payment of KD 10 in cash, he started leaving without issuing any receipt. When I insisted on a receipt for KD 10, he threatened me, saying that he would impound my vehicle. He pocketed the amount and left without issuing any receipt. He was not even wearing his badge.

I request you to kindly visualize a situation where this police officer harasses and fleeces several gullible victims a day and pockets all cash collections. What a terrible damage to the image of the country and the reputation of its police force!

KUWAIT'S DRIVE TOWARD FUEL SUBSIDY RATIONALIZATION

COST-SAVING MEASURE - PART OF A LARGER ECONOMIC STRATEGY

KUWAIT: The government's recent decision to make cuts to Kuwait's petrol subsidy system is expected to boost state coffers amid lower global oil prices, despite some pushback from organized labor. In June, Adnan Abdulsamad, head of the National Assembly's budget committee, announced plans to reduce allocations for petrol subsidies to KD 238 million (\$790 million) in FY 2016/17, significantly lower than the estimated KD 4 billion (\$13.3 billion) previously spent annually. The cost-saving measure is part of a larger economic strategy aimed at reforming the public sector and increasing private sector participation in economic development.

Subsidy removals save money

Following an earlier move to remove subsidies on diesel and kerosene, launched last year, the new system will be carried out in stages. In August, authorities announced petrol prices would increase significantly beginning in September, with price hikes ranging from 40 percent to more than 80 percent depending on the grade. The price of low-octane petrol rose by 41 percent to .85 fils (\$0.28) per liter, high-grade petrol by 61 percent to 105 fils (\$0.35) per liter and lowemission ultra petrol by 83 percent to 165 fils (\$0.55) per liter. Public transport and taxi fares were also raised to reflect the higher petrol cost, though they remain the lowest in the GCC, according to statements from the Ministry of Interior.

From theory to practice

This marks the first time in nearly two decades that the state has increased petrol prices, making Kuwait the last GCC country to do so following the mid-2014 oil price crash, which saw Brent crude fall from more than \$115 per barrel to less than \$30 this January. Prices have since recovered somewhat, to around \$48 as of early September. Energy subsidies have long been a significant

expense for the state, equivalent to between 1.3 percent and 5.7 percent of Kuwait's GDP per year, according to Work Bank estimates, which take into account environmental, health and other externalities.

International response

A firm decision to increase prices sends a strong signal that the government is intent on implementing a series of sweeping economic reforms, as highlighted by the sixpoint economic strategy unveiled by Anas Khalid Al Saleh, deputy prime minister, minister of finance and acting minister of oil, in February. The plan emphasizes financial reforms, increasing private sector participation in economic development, as well as changes to the labor market and public sector. These reforms are also seen as critical for sustainable long-term growth, particularly given the record KD8.7 billion (\$29 billion) deficit forecast for FY 2016/17. A host of international stakeholders, including the World Bank, have praised the government's decision.

Special Report

"Energy subsidy reforms provide a significant opportunity to... reform the energy sector and remove the inefficiencies along the value chain," the bank said in a statement days after the price hikes were announced. "The current environment of low oil prices presents an opportunity to reform energy subsidies with minimal impact on consumers, while generating fiscal savings at a time when fiscal pressures are increasing." The World Bank added that it expects subsidy reforms to encourage the development of labor-intensive industries, another top priority in the country's drive to foster non-energy growth.

Potential roadblocks

Government plans could prove problematic, however, as a result of pushback from labor unions, which are much more robust and politically active than elsewhere in the GCC. Indeed, on August 10, the central council of the Labor Union of Kuwait announced a rejection of the petrol subsidy removal. This is not the first time the state has attempted to cancel or reduce its subsidies. Other recent efforts - including a fuel price hike announced in January of last year - have met with resistance in parliament and were delayed as result.

Additionally, earlier planned reforms to the salary and bonus schemes of energy workers triggered a three-day strike in April, during which time oil output fell from 3m to roughly 1.1m barrels per day. Although the World Bank notes that per liter petrol prices in Kuwait will still be roughly half of those paid in Europe - and indeed the lowest in the GCC - the government will likely continue to face some resistance in rolling back popular subsidies.

Movements of Refugees

He was addressing a high-level summit on Addressing Large Movements of Refugees and Migrants. He said the parties of all conflicts should allow access of humanitarian aid to those who deserve it, respect UN Charter, international humanitarian law, human rights law, and international refugee law. "We also need to activate the international mechanisms to criminalize all internationally banned acts, and insist that impunity cannot be an option in armed conflicts," he asserted. Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled said the proliferation of conflicts and civil wars in Middle East have political, economic, social, development and humanitarian consequences.

This, he added, "must drive us to foster our joint action to address the extraordinary conditions being endured by the people in the region, especially in Palestine, Syria, Yemen and Somalia." Kuwait, said the senior official, has been providing humanitarian assistance to all countries in need, exceeding two billion dollars over the past five years, or 2.1 percent of GDP. Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled said today's summit was being held in "exceptional" circumstances due to the growing number of humanitarian crises caused by armed conflicts or natural disasters, forcing over 65 million people to be either refugees or internally displaced, in addition to 224 million migrants registered in 2015.

He urged the UN to create innovative mechanisms and creative ideas with objective of dealing with crises whose numbers have multiplied significantly during the past 10 years, and were claiming lives of civilians, women, children and the elderly. He urged the international community to work on protecting those peoples from the danger of drifting towards the vicious circle of violence and terrorism.

Xenophobia, fanaticism

Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled said the international community must also combat socalled "xenophobia," fanaticism and violence against refugees and migrants in order to fulfill their aspirations and hopes to live in peace and security, as well as enabling them to live a free and dignified life. He also called for solving the plight of Palestinian refugees who were suffering from the oppressive injustice for almost seven decades. "We affirm their (Palestinian) right of return, and call for a just solution for their plight," in line with UN General Assembly resolution 194 and the Arab Peace Initiative, he said, calling for continued support for the UN Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA).

Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled noted that the adoption of the political declaration of this summit represented an "important step on the path of our collective humanitarian action." Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled was accompanied to the summit by Assistant Foreign Minister for Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled's office Ambassador Sheikh Dr Ahmad Nasser Al-Sabah and UN Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador Mansour Ayyad Al-Otaibi. — KUNA Director General of Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) Sheikh Mubarak Duaij Al-Ibrahim Al-Sabah.



IRAN'S PRESIDENT IN CUBA, MEETS CASTROS

HAVANA: Iranian President Hassan Rouhani arrived in Cuba Monday where he met with his counterpart, Raul Castro, and the Cuban president's older brother and predecessor, Fidel Castro. Rouhani had said ahead of the one-day visit that he wanted to stop in Cuba, a "friendly and revolutionary country," on his way to the United Nations General Assembly in New York.

The visit follows one in August by Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif, who said Iran sees this as "a very opportune moment" to reinforce its ties with the communist island. Officials are due to sign a series of deals, expected to include

one on energy. Cuba is keen for oil as its key supplier, Venezuela, has dramatically cut its once generous discount sales amid an economic crisis.

United mainly by their shared history of enmity with the United States, Iran and Cuba often back each other in the international arena. Tehran has vocally condemned the US embargo on Cuba, and Havana has supported Iran's right to a civilian nuclear program.

The Castro regime's resentment over the more than five-decade embargo, which remains in place, is still strong despite the renewal of diplomatic ties with Washington last year. —AFP **NEW YORK:** To neighbors and customers of his family's storefront chicken takeout, Ahmad Khan Rahami was a friendly, quiet presence behind the counter who liked talking about cars and was generous with free food.

So when the 28-year-old Afghan immigrant was apprehended Monday as the lead person of interest in bombings in New York and New Jersey, those who knew him expressed shock, questioning whether his turn to religiosity in recent years might have hinted at views otherwise kept hidden.

Rahami's father and brothers had long nursed tensions with neighbors and officials in Elizabeth, New Jersey, over the restaurant's late hours, a conflict the family claimed in a lawsuit was the result of discrimination against them as Muslims. But Ahmad Rahami's demeanor increasingly devout but more likely to talk about worldly pursuits than his faith - never hinted at anything but goodwill, customers said. "He'd always talk about his cars. He loved his Civics, he loved going fast," said Ryan McCann, a frequent customer at First American Fried Chicken, the restaurant that Rahami's father, Mohammed Rahami, has run since 2002. "He was so friendly he'd give us free chicken here and there, just because we shopped there so much."

'Clear as day'

Ahmad Rahami, a naturalized US citizen, was taken into custody after a shootout with police in Linden, a nearby town. A law enforcement official says fingerprints and surveillance video helped investigators identify him as the man suspected of setting off bombs in the New York area over the weekend. The official says he's seen in surveillance footage "clear as day" at the scene of the Saturday night bombing in Manhattan.

The official says investigators recovered his fingerprints from the scene. Rahami wasn't on any terror or no-fly watch lists, a law enforcement official said, but he'd been interviewed by officials for immigration purposes. Another law enforcement official says investigators pulled over a car carrying three men and two women "associated" with Rahami when it appeared headed toward an airport Sunday.

The officials spoke to The Associated Press on the condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to speak publicly about the case. As FBI agents removed bags of evidence from the restaurant Monday, officials and residents

recalled Rahami and his family, who shared an apartment over the business.

Flee Jones, 27, who said he'd known Rahami since they were teenagers, told reporters he'd noticed a change in Rahami's personality after a trip to Afghanistan in 2014. When Rahami returned, he "got more religious" and dressed differently than before, Jones said. "He was more quiet and more mature," Jones said. "I said, 'Oh, where have you been?' And he said, 'Oh, vacation.' But I knew he went to Afghanistan because his little brother said it."

A photo of Rahami, published in the Edison High School yearbook when he graduated in 2007, shows him with a carefully groomed goatee, wearing a crimson vest and tie. Rahami went on to attend Middlesex County College from 2010 to 2012, majoring in criminal justice, but didn't graduate.

Andre Almeida, a customer at the restaurant for the past eight years, said he noticed when Rahami stopped wearing Western clothes after returning from Afghanistan and started wearing "a little more ethnic clothing."

Previous charges

Rahami was accused of stabbing a relative in 2014, but a grand jury declined to proceed with criminal charges, court records show. He also was accused of violating a domestic-violence restraining order in 2012.

A Democratic New Jersey congressman, Albio Sires, said Rahami contacted his office from Pakistan in 2014 seeking help because his wife had an expired Pakistani passport.

Sires said his office wrote a letter to the US embassy in Pakistan to check on the status of the case and the woman eventually received a visa. He said he didn't know if she ever came to the country, and the FBI didn't answer when asked on Monday. Neighbors had complained to Elizabeth officials that the Rahamis' restaurant was a late-night nuisance, Democratic Elizabeth Mayor Christian Bollwage said.

Rahami's father and two brothers sued the city in 2011 after Elizabeth police said the restaurant stayed open past 10 p.m. in violation of a local ordinance. The Rahamis charged in the lawsuit they were targeted by police because they're Muslims.

The harassment, the lawsuit alleged, was based largely on the complaints to officials by one neighbor who regularly walked into the restaurant to tell them that "Muslims don't belong here" and "Muslims are trouble."

Adjudication of the lawsuit was put on hold in 2011 when the elder Rahami traveled to Pakistan and was unable to return to the US in time, court filings show. The lawsuit was terminated in 2012 after one of the brothers, Mohammed K. Rahami, pleaded guilty to blocking police from enforcing restrictions on the restaurant. But neighbors aware of tensions over the restaurant said Ahmad Rahami was easy to get along with, if somewhat reserved. "He was just very quiet," said Jorge Vasquez, who owns a business a block over and frequently visited the restaurant.

As police searched for Ahmad Rahami on Monday, the owner of a bar in Linden found a man sleeping in his hallway. The man was initially presumed to be a vagrant, but police officers who responded quickly realized it was Rahami, Democratic Linden Mayor Derek Armstead said. Armstead said the man pulled out a handgun and fired at the officers, hitting one in a bulletproof vest. He said the man then began firing as he ran down the street and police shot him in the leg.

Rahami was charged with attempted murder of a law enforcement officer, unlawful possession of a weapon and possession of a weapon for an unlawful purpose, prosecutors said. Bail was set at \$5.2 million. —AP

PRESSURE ON ARGENTINA'S MACRI TO KEEP VOW ON SYRIAN REFUGEES

BUENOS AIRES: Having escaped the civil war in her homeland to find refuge in Argentina, Nairouz Baloul hopes the South American nation will now welcome many more Syrians like her to begin a new life. President Mauricio Macri has said he wants to allow more than 3,000 Syrian refugees into Argentina. But the plan has stalled, and organizations and members of Argentinaís Syrian community are pressuring the administration to keep its promise. ilf he has the key to unlock this, I think he shouldnít hesitate to open the door to other human beings,î said Baloul, 29, an English teacher who escaped what she calls a iliving nightmareî in Syria.

One of her brothers was killed by a bomb in Damascus in 2014. She prefers not to speak about it but since she arrived in Buenos Aires last month with another brother, she has become hopeful that the rest of their family will be able to join them in Argentina. il feel safe now, but lim not totally happy because I want others to be safe as well,î Baloul said. Foreign Minister Susana Malcorra said Monday that the government is fully committed to bringing in 3,000 Syrians, but she warned that a timeline has not been set. iThis will not happen from one day to the next,î she said. iBut we have a commitment because Argentina is a country of immigrants, of refugees, and it's unlikely that any of us doesnít have a grandfather, a great-grandfather who hasnít escaped a war, a famine.î ìWe believe this is the time to set an example,î Malcorra said.

delay, although Argentinaís economy is in recession and Macri has faced unrest for cutting government spending. While the government decides how to

implement the plan, dozens of Argentine families have already volunteered to welcome Syrians into their homes. Among them is Mariano Winograd, a fruit and vegetable wholesaler who received a young newlywed couple from Syria to his home earlier this year. Il just want to give back what was given to my family,î said Winograd, the son of Jewish immigrants who came to Argentina to escape World War II.

Winograd, the head of a local group known as Humanitarian Refugee, works closely with an Argentine priest based in Aleppo, Syria, who helps families desperate to escape one of that countryis fiercest battlegrounds. Amnesty International on Monday urged Argentina to implement a comprehensive plan for bringing in Syrian refugees.

The human rights group displayed a replica of a Syrian home that has been erected in a busy subway station in the Argentine capital. Images of relentless bombings were projected on screens on its windows in an effort to call attention to the more than 4 million Syrians who have sought refuge abroad since civil war erupted in 2011. il think the Argentine state has the good intention to help in this humanitarian crisis, but it is limited (by resources).

But for us, the economic excuse is not valid,î said Leah Tandeter, head of international justice for Amnesty Internationalís local branch. Macri and other world leaders in New York for the UN General Assembly meeting on Monday discussed the situation of the world's 65.3 million displaced people. The talks were held as the first summit on Addressing Large Movements of Refugees and Migrants. — AP

US CLINGS TO HOPE OF TRUCE AS SYRIA SINKS INTO CHAOS

CEASEFIRE IN QUESTION

NEW YORK: As Syria plunged back into bloodshed and the UN suspended humanitarian aid convoys yesterday, world powers struggled to convince themselves that a ceasefire can be salvaged.

US Secretary of State John Kerry insisted that US-Russian attempts to broker a truce in the civil war are "not dead" and promised international talks will resume this week. President Barack Obama backed his top diplomat, saying a short time later that there was "no ultimate military victory to be won" and calling on nations to pursue the "hard work" of diplomacy. But Kerry's terse declaration, after a brief meeting in New York of the International Syria Support Group, could not conceal a pessimistic mood among his fellow foreign ministers.

Kerry arrived for the ISSG meeting with his Russian opposite number and constant sparring partner Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, co-chair of the 23-nation group. Relations between the nominal partners were already at a low ebb after a mistaken US-led coalition air strike on Saturday killed dozens of Syrian soldiers.

envoy Staffan de Mistura a chance to insist that the process has not collapsed. The talks lasted less than an hour and participants said the mood was tense but serious. Kerry's spokesman John Kirby said the ministers "agreed that, despite continued violence, there was still an imperative to pursue a nationwide cessation of hostilities based on the arrangement reached last week in Geneva between the United States and Russia. "Quite frankly, the Kerry-Lavrov process is the only show in town and we've got to get that show back on the road," Britain's Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson said.

His French counterpart Jean-Marc Ayrault warned that trust was breaking down in the US-Russian partnership and said other countries should help push the process forward. "It was a fairly dramatic meeting, the mood was gloomy. Is there hope? I can't answer that yet, but we should do everything we can," he told reporters. "The US-Russian negotiation has reached its limit. There's a lot left unsaid. The Russians and the Americans can't do it alone."

'Savage attack'

US officials have demanded that Russia take responsibility for what they said was an air strike on a UN aid convoy near the northern city of Aleppo by either Russian or allied Syrian warplanes. The Russian defense ministry has denied any role in the attack, attempting to point the figure at rebels against Bashar al-Assad's Syrian regime. A short distance across Manhattan at the UN meeting, Secretary General Ban Ki-moon denounced the "sickening, savage and apparent-ly deliberate attack" that left around 20 dead.

And Germany's Foreign Minister Frank-Walter Steinmeier confirmed that it had poisoned the mood at the ISSG, where delegates were "heavy with indignation." "All were clearly aware of the fact that we find ourselves once more at a threshold for Syria," he said. "There's only one viable path for Syria and that is to always make a new effort to reduce violence. In order to achieve this, also the regional powers have to do more."

Fighting rages

TRUMP, CLINTON COMPETE TO MEET TOP LEADERS IN NEW YORK

NEW YORK: Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton met Egypt's president in New York on Monday as the two US presidential candidates tried to bolster their diplomatic credentials at the United Nations.

Democratic standard-bearer Clinton said last week that she would meet Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, along with leaders from Japan and Ukraine on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly. She spent more than an hour locked in private discussions with the Egyptian leader, with aides later saying they had discussed issues ranging from counter-terrorism to human rights. Trump's meeting with Sisi-the first time the Republican presidential candidate has met a leader from the Muslim world-appeared to be a response to his opponent's program. The former reality TV star, who has previously called for a ban on Muslims entering the United States, spoke with Sisi at New York's La Guardia airport, after flying in from Florida.

Trump told Sisi-who has been much-criticized by rights groups for his intolerance of dissent-that "under a Trump administration, the United States of America will be a loyal friend, not simply an ally, that Egypt can count on." Trump has called for "extreme vetting" of refugees entering the United States along with a ban on people from "terrorist nations." But he also told Sisi about "his high regard for peace-loving Muslims," according to a statement released by his campaign. In an interview with Fox television earlier on Monday, Trump alluded to the impending visit, saying that meetings with other foreign leaders were also on his agenda. — AFP

The vote comes at a time of regional turmoil, including domestic and external security threats to pro-Western Jordan by Islamic State extremists who control large areas in neighboring Syria and Iraq. In holding regular elections, Jordan seeks to strengthen its image as an island of stability in the region.

However, parliament is weak, with most powers remaining in the hands of King Abdullah II. Polls have indicated widespread voter apathy, predicting more than half of potential voters won't cast a ballot, despite the participation of the Brotherhood. Polls had been scheduled to close at 7 p.m. (1600 GMT), but voting was extended by an hour in 15 of 23 districts, including the cities of Amman, Irbid and Zarqa. Further extensions were possible, said Independent Election Commission spokesman Jihad Momani, citing a late voter surge. In principle, more than 4.1 million Jordanians older than 17 were eligible to vote, but those presently abroad - about 1 million according to Momani - cannot cast ballots. By 7 p.m., 1.42 million Jordanians had voted.

Voter increase by half since 2013

The potential voter pool was half that size in 2013, when voters had to pre-register and turnout reached 56 percent. Voter Nour al-Ghwairi, 44, said she hoped the new parliament would tackle Jordan's economic difficulties, such as rising joblessness, particularly among the young. "The country suffers from unemployment and other problems," she said after voting in the Jabal Hussein neighborhood of the capital, Amman. Elsewhere in central Amman, 71year-old Othman Abu Felah said he didn't ing parliament, said that Jordan is proud to hold elections in a stable atmosphere. "We resort to ballot boxes and to the electoral process to select the path for the future, and we don't resort to anything else," he said, apparently referring to escalating conflicts in the region. Tuesday's election is being held under new rules that replace the "one man, one vote" system. The old method, in place since 1993, had discouraged the formation of political parties.

Critics said the latest electoral reforms have fallen short and are unlikely to lead to meaningful change. They said they expect the new parliament to be similar to the outgoing one - largely made up of individuals with competing, narrow interests.

New rules

Under new voting rules, voters chose candidates from lists in 23 electoral districts. In all, 1,252 candidates ran on 226 lists. Only six percent of the lists are affiliated with a specific political party, 11 percent have some party representatives, 39 percent are independent and 43 percent are based on tribal affiliations, according to the International Republican Institute, a U.S.based non-partisan group that seeks to promote democracy. "While there might be some consolidation compared to previous parliaments, you are still going to see a parliament of individuals," said Ramsey Day, the IRI's Jordan director. He said this is "somewhat inconsistent" with what has been cited as the ultimate goal of democratic reforms, a government formed by parliament. "While this (election) might take a step forward toward that, it's quite a small step," he said. Anja Wehler-Schoeck, Jordan director of Germany's Friedrich Ebert Foundation, said that "we are still very far from" a robust parliamentary democracy. — AP

2 MISSING CALIFORNIA TODDLERS FOUND DEAD IN NEIGHBOR'S POOL

FRESNO: Two toddlers drowned in their next-door neighbor's swimming pool after apparently wandering out of their home Monday. No foul play was suspected, police said. The 2-year-old girl and 3year-old boy were being watched by their great-grandmother when they left the house sometime Monday morning. Family members searched for the children for an hour before calling police, Fresno Police Lt. Joe Gomez said. The children were last seen in a room with access to a garage that had its door open. Investigators believe the toddlers left their home through the garage and walked to the neighbor's house.

They entered the neighbor's yard through an open gate and climbed or squeezed through a 4-foot high wrought

iron fence surrounding the pool, Gomez said. "There were some bikes next to the fence they could have used to climb over it," he said. "It appears to be an extremely unfortunate tragic accident."

Their next door neighbor, Elizabeth Valle, found the kids in her pool after a police officer asked her for permission to search her backyard. Valle told the Fresno Bee that she screamed and jumped into the pool, as did one of the officers. The boy was floating in the water, and the girl was found at the bottom. Officers and paramedics tried to revive the children, Valle said. They were pronounced dead at a hospital. Valle told the newspaper she found the same children unattended in her backyard about six months ago and walked them home. —AP

WASHINGTON: Donald Trump is underwriting his presidential bid by selling the Donald Trump lifestyle - and campaign finance records show it is working. For the low price of \$25, you can snag a Trump Gold Card emblazoned with your name or join a campaign "Board of Directors" that comes with a personalized certificate. For \$30, there's Trump's signature hats - billed as "the most popular product in America." Supporters can elevate themselves to "big league" by ponying up \$184 for a signed, "now out of print" copy of Trump's book, "The Art of the Deal."

There's a catch to some of these merchandizing claims. There is no evidence the board of directors exists. "The Art of the Deal" is still in print, available for \$9.34 in paperback. And the new campaign edition of the book is signed by an autopen, not Trump, as noted in the solicitation's fine print.

Regardless, the appeals have paid off. Trump's campaign says it has 2.1 million donors despite having just begun fundraising in earnest three months ago.

Democratic nominee Hillary Clinton, who has been amassing a donor rolodex for decades, has 2.3 million contributors, her campaign says. People giving \$200 or less make up about half of his campaign funds, according to federal fundraising reports through July. For Clinton, those small gifts account for about 19 percent.

"His brand appeals to quite a number of people," said John Thompson, digital fundraising director for Ted Cruz's Republican presidential campaign. "It's smart for him to use it for fundraising. The celebrity factor builds a natural donor community on its own, without him having to do too much."

Natural fit for Trump

Hyperbolic campaign marketing is a natural fit for Trump, who has puffed up the value of what he sold throughout his business career. At times, Trump has sold golf memberships or Trump University seminars at a "discount" from an imaginary, inflated price; and he has declared condo projects close to selling out when

to say it in the most positive way possible," Trump once told attorneys who asked him whether he had ever lied about his properties to sell them. "I'm no different from a politician running for office." Perhaps it is no surprise, then, that his campaign has adopted that same approach, outspending Clinton on campaign merchandise while running a brisk retail operation that helps him raise the money for, among other things, crucial get-out-the-vote efforts and advertising to spread his message. Trump's appeals for smaller contributions are reminiscent of Bernie Sanders, whose signature line in the Democratic primary this year was that his campaign was paid for by \$27 donations. Sanders' digital fundraiser, Michael Whitney, questioned whether Trump's small donor haul would continue since it does not appear the campaign has done much to get email addresses that could be turned into fresh batches of new potential donors. "This feels more like a battering ram than a well-thought-out digital program,"Whitney said.

Gold cards

One of Trump's most frequent fundraising offers has been a "gold card" that identifies the holder as an Executive Member for a "one-time induction fee." "In the past, I have asked supporters for a one-time induction fee of \$100. But because of your outstanding generosity to date, I am only asking you to make a \$35 contribution," the email asks.

The Associated Press found no evidence of an online solicitation in which the card was sold for the undiscounted price of \$100.

The gold card offer is reminiscent of a Trump Visa card that became available in 2004. In a press release for it, Trump pitched it as "the best deal" and warned declining it "could get you fired."

Trump also seeks to make would-be donors feel like part of the campaign. Several emails have sought "campaign advice," asked for help with debate preparation and even offered people the chance to join a campaign "board of directors." There's no evidence such a board exists, and the campaign did not

respond to questions about it. But the gold card and executive board membership gimmicks are getting results, said Tom Sather, senior director of research at the email data solutions firm Return Path. The firm measures emails much the way Nielsen measures television viewership, by extrapolating from a large panel of study participants.

Emails from the Trump campaign and Trump joint committees with the Republican Party have an average open rate of 11 percent, Sather said. The 10 gold card-related emails had a far higher open rate of 18 percent, and executive board emails had an open rate of 19 percent, he said.

"These kinds of offers intrigue people and make them feel exclusive and special," he said. Ever the marketer, Trump has also dominated the campaign swag front. In April, May and June, Trump spent about \$3 million on merchandise that's then sold to donors, an AP review of campaign finance reports found. Clinton's operation spent about \$2 million in the same time period. —AP

CLINTON SAYS TRUMP GIVES 'AID, COMFORT' TO ISIS RECRUITERS

Who is more qualified to combat terrorism?

ESTERO, FLORIDA: Hillary Clinton is accusing Donald Trump of giving "aid and comfort" to Islamic terrorists, declaring his anti-Muslim rhetoric helps the Islamic State group and other militants recruit new fighters. Trump is insisting the US should "use whatever lawful methods are available" to get information from the Afghan immigrant arrested in this weekend's bombings. As Trump supporters at a packed rally in Florida shouted "Hang him!" the Republican presidential candidate mocked the fact that Ahmad Khan Rahami, a 28year-old US citizen originally from Afghanistan, would receive quality medical care and legal representation. "We must deliver a just and very harsh punishment to these people," he said. "These are enemies, these are combatants and we have to be tough, we have to be strong."

Both candidates moved swiftly to capitalize on investigations into a weekend of violent attacks -

bombings in New York and New Jersey and stabbings at a Minnesota mall - casting themselves as most qualified to combat terrorism at home and abroad. Clinton touted her national security

credentials at a hastily arranged news conference outside her campaign plane, accusing Trump of using the incidents to make "some kind of demagogic point."

Key selling points Clinton and

her team see her experience and what they say is her steady judgment as key selling points for her candidacy. On the campaign trail, she frequently invokes her role in the 2011 raid that killed Osama bin Laden, describing to voters the tense atmosphere in the White House alongside President Barack Obama at that moment.

But while much of the foreign policy establishment has rallied around Clinton, Trump's anti-immigrant rhetoric, promises to close US borders and vows to aggressively profile potential terrorists have fueled his presidential bid.

On Monday, he called for tougher policing, including profiling foreigners who look like they could have connections to terrorism or certain Middle Eastern nations. "This isn't just a matter of terrorism, this is also really a question of quality of life," he said. "We want to make sure we're only admitting people into our country who love our country." — AP

DONALD TRUMP JR. LIKENS SYRIAN **REFUGEES TO POISONED SKITTLES**

WASHINGTON: Donald Trump Jr. has posted a message on Twitter likening Syrian refugees to a bowl of poisoned Skittles. Seeking to promote his father's presidential campaign, the younger Trump posted a tweet featuring a bowl of the candy Skittles with a warning. "If I had a bowl of skittles and I told you just three would kill you, would you take a handful?" said the tweet on the verified @DonaldTrumpJr handle. "That's our Syrian refugee problem," said the post, which caused a stir and negative tweets on the internet into Tuesday. Trump Jr.'s tweet said, "This image says it all. Let's end the politically correct agenda that doesn't put America first." His father has advocated sharply restraining immigration and has accused opponent Hillary Clinton of advocating acceptance of tens of thousands of refugees.

Skittles parent company, Wrigley Americas, distanced itself from the tweet with a terse response opposing Trump Jr.'s premise. "Skittles are candy. Refugees are people. We don't feel it's an appropriate analogy," Vice President of Corporate Affairs Denise Young said in the statement. "We will respectfully refrain from further commentary as anything we say could be misinterpreted as marketing." Trump Jr.'s tweet repeats an analogy that has been on the internet for years, using M&Ms and other foods, and targeting a variety of groups. When former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee was running for the Republican presidential nomination last year, he used peanuts to warn about the risk of admitting refugees. In a Nov. 17 interview on MSNBC, he asked, if there was a five-pound bag of peanuts and "there were about 10 peanuts that were deadly poisonous, would you feed them to your kids? The answer is no."

Generating some controversy lately

Trump Jr. has been generating some controversy lately. Last week, he made what some took as a Holocaustthemed joke in an interview with a Philadelphia radio station, referring to "warming up the gas chamber." He has denied he was alluding to the

Holocaust. He also told the Pittsburgh Tribune-Review that it would be unwise for his father to release his tax returns because it would "distract" from his father's "main message." His father has repeatedly said the reason he has not released his returns is because they are being audited by the Internal Revenue Service.

Trump Jr.'s tweet came as world leaders meeting at the United Nations on Monday approved a declaration aimed at providing a more coordinated and humane response to the global refugee crisis, among which Syrians are a major grouping.

During the campaign Trump has repeatedly called for a moratorium on accepting Syrian refugees. This is part of a more wide-ranging policy on immigrants that has ranged from an outright ban on foreign Muslim immigrants entering the United States "until we know what the hell is going on" to "extreme" vetting and an ideological test for would-be immigrants from countries and regions plagued by extremism. — AFP

FLORIDA AG DEFENDS DECISION TO TAKE MONEY FROM TRUMP

TALLAHASSEE: Florida Attorney General Pam Bondi yesterday defended her decision three years ago to solicit \$25,000 from Donald Trump at the same time questions were arising about Trump University.

The Republican and former prosecutor said she had no regrets about asking Trump for money and no regrets about keeping the donation even after New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman had filed a lawsuit against Trump University. "If I had returned it, you would have reported 'Bondi accepted a bribe, got caught and returned it," Bondi said. "That's how the reporting goes. And so, no, there was nothing improper about it. So there was no reason to return it."

The 2013 check to a committee supporting Bondi's reelection campaign from the Donald J. Trump Foundation violated a federal prohibition against charities giving money to political groups. The issue flared back to life amid media coverage of Trump's presidential campaign and the recent news that his foundation paid a \$2,500 fine to the IRS over the donation. Democrats in Washington and Florida have been demanding investigations into how Bondi's office handled questions about Trump University and the Trump Institute, companies that offered get-richquick real-estate seminars.

Yesterday marked the first time that Bondi - who endorsed Trump for president shortly before the Florida primary in March - answered in detail questions about her handling of the donation. Though both Trump University and the Florida-based Trump Institute had stopped offering classes by the time she took office in 2011, her office had received more than 20 complaints from upset former students who claimed they were scammed.

Trump has said in the past that he expected and received favors from politicians to whom he has given money. The Associated Press reported in June that Bondi personally asked Trump for help for her 2014 re-election. She said Tuesday that she turned to Trump because he was on a list of "friends and family" she sought money from when she first ramped up fundraising efforts. Bondi set up her accounts in early August 2013. Trump signed a check on Sept. 9 and it was received by Bondi's political committee on Sept. 17. But by that time, emails show, top officials in her office - including her chief of staff - were being asked by reporters in Florida about Schneiderman's lawsuit.

Bondi's office said at the time that it was "reviewing' the lawsuit, but it never took any other action. Bondi said her office receives tens of thousands of complaints each year. There was never an investigation into Donald Trump by this office," Bondi said. She added that "we raise millions of dollars, that's only 25,000 in the whole scheme of a campaign." Bondi said that she was unaware that her office had been asked about the New York lawsuit until a Florida columnist highlighted the case and the donation from Trump in October 2013.

She said she tried to return the \$25,000 check to Trump this year when she found out that the money came from his foundation and not from his personal funds. But the Trump Foundation returned the money and told Bondi's accountant that Trump himself had reimbursed the money.

Even after questions were raised about the propriety of her taking money from Trump, she still welcomed the billionaire businessman's support. Trump hosted a March 2014 fundraiser for Bondi on the lawn of his palatial Mar-a-Lago Club in Palm Beach, Florida. — AP

BERLIN POLITICIAN, YOUNGER MAN FOUND DEAD IN APARTMENT

BERLIN: A well-known member of Berlin's Pirate Party was found dead in his apartment after apparently taking his own life, along with the body of another man whom police said yesterday was killed by blunt force trauma.

Berlin police said a "farewell letter" led them to the apartment in Berlin's southwestern Steglitz neighborhood on Monday afternoon, when they found the two bodies. Autopsies performed yesterday suggest the apartment's 44-year-old tenant killed himself while the signs of blunt force trauma to the upper body the second man exhibited indicate he was slain a few days before, police said.

The victim was a "younger man, whose identity has not yet been fully confirmed," police said, adding that their homicide unit was investigating. Police did not release names, but the Pirate Party, founded a decade

ago with a focus on internet freedom, identified the 44-year-old as Gerwald Claus-Brunner, a party member who served in the Berlin state parliament.

The party said the popular politician, known for wearing a trademark bandanna and overalls, had been suffering from an "incurable illness." It said nothing about the second person. The bodies were found the day after the Pirate Party took only 1.7 percent of the votes in Berlin's state election and was voted out of parliament.

Claus-Brunner likely died before the election, however, Berlin's B.Z. newspaper said, citing law enforcement sources. Germany's Bild newspaper, also citing law enforcement sources, said the victim was approximately 29-years-old and might have been killed in another location and moved to the apartment. —AP


8 NEW ARRESTS IN FRANCE TRUCK ATTACK THAT KILLED 86 IN NICE

LINKED TO THE ATTACKER

PARIS: French authorities have made eight new arrests in connection with the Bastille Day truck attack in Nice that left 86 people dead, the Paris prosecutor's office said yesterday.

The office said the suspects detained Monday were French and Tunisian and had links to the attacker, Mohamed Lahouaiej Bouhlel, who plowed a 19-ton truck down Nice's Promenade des Anglais and into a crowd assembled for a July 14 fireworks display. All eight were arrested in the Alpes-Maritimes region in the southeastern corner of France that includes Nice. At least five people already face preliminary terrorism charges in the attack, and are accused of helping

Bouhlel obtain a pistol and providing other support. It wasn't immediately



The Islamic State group has claimed responsibility for the July 14 attack. French authorities say Bouhlel, a Tunisian with French residency, was inspired by the extremist group's propaganda, but they say no evidence has been found that IS orchestrated the attack.

France remains under a state of emergency after the Nice killings and IS attacks on Paris last year. Interior Minister Bernard Cazeneuve said yesterday that the threat to France is higher than ever. He said about 300 people have been arrested in investigations into extremist networks so far this year, according to his office.

Also yesterday, authorities detained two boys, 14 and 17, in an investigation into a hoax hostage alert at a Paris church, the prosecutor's office said. The false alarm Saturday prompted a big police deployment and activation of an app-based terrorism alert system. A 16-year-old detained Monday remains in custody.

FRANCE WANTS INTERNATIONAL MIDEAST CONFERENCE THIS YEAR

UNITED NATIONS: France said Monday it wants to organize an international conference before the end of the year to present Israelis and Palestinians with a package of incentives if they reach a peace agreement.

Foreign Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault said at a briefing on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly's annual ministerial meeting that "this week must be a moment of political mobilization that we can reach that goal."

Ayrault's push for an international conference in France follows an announcement by Russia's Foreign Ministry on Sept. 8 that Israeli and Palestinian leaders have agreed "in principle" to meet in Moscow for talks. But the wide gaps between Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas raise doubts about the prospect for any meeting - and if there is one whether they would make any progress.

Abbas demands that Israel halt all settle-

ment construction in east Jerusalem and the West Bank, and release about two dozen Palestinian prisoners before any meeting. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu rejects the preconditions.

Ayrault said several countries, including Egypt, Russia and the United States, are trying to restart talks between Israel and the Palestinians. He said he told them that "all efforts are in fact complementary of the French initiative."

A statement from Secretary of State John Kerry's office said Kerry met Abbas in New York to discuss "our shared goal of a two state solution." It said Kerry voiced "concern over trends on the ground, including the recent surge in violence and settlement activity."

France hosted an international meeting in Paris in June attended by more than two dozen Western and Arab countries to try to come up with a new strategy for Mideast peace and revive Israeli-Palestinian negotiations, which have been all but dead for over two years. The Israeli and Palestinian leaders were not invited. The participants welcomed the "prospect" of a conference with both parties later this year.

Ayrault hosted a closed meeting Monday for officials from the countries that attended the June conference. Russia has clamored unsuccessfully for years to host a meeting of the two leaders but Russia's Foreign Ministry gave no date or agenda for the future get-together.

The United States has maintained a stranglehold over all Mideast peace processes since the Oslo Accords in the 1990s.

For years, the US was seen by Israelis and Palestinians as the indispensable mediator and only power that could guarantee a twostate solution. But the Obama administration doesn't appear to enjoy that recognition any longer. —AP

POPE MEETS REFUGEES, RELIGIOUS LEADERS AT ASSISI PEACE DAY

ASSISI, ITALY: War refugees and leaders and representatives of several religions, including Christians, Jews, Muslims, Hindus and others, joined Pope Francis yesterday in a day of prayer for peace in Assisi, the hometown of St. Francis, who preached tolerance and gentleness.

After chatting and shaking hands with dozens of participants, Francis sat down to dine with them in the Franciscan convent. The quests included 12 refugees who fled war and conflicts in Nigeria, Eritrea, Mali and Syria, which was represented by three Christians who fled the besieged city of Aleppo.

Francis took his papal name from the peace-loving saint who was born in the Umbrian hill town, where Franciscans from the religious order founded by the medieval saint care for the basilica and its renowned artworks.

St. John Paul II established the inter-religious prayer gathering in Assisi in 1986. This year, Christians were invited to pray in the Basilica

of St. Francis, while those from other religions will pray in the town that for centuries has drawn admirers of the saint who abandoned family wealth for an austere existence of preaching tolerance.

The closing event gathers all participants in Assisi's main square for speeches by the pope, Orthodox Patriarch Bartholomew I, a representative each from Islam, Judaism and Buddhism, and remarks from a victim of war. Then time was allotted for a moment of silence for victims of war.

Francis has urged people worldwide to find time to pray on yesterday whenever then can. From the start of his papacy in 2013, Francis has decried war and conflicts which he says are tantamount to a "Third World War in segments."

He has also pressed for countries and individuals to welcome refugees. As an example, he flew Syrian civil war refugees back to Rome with him after his visit to the Greek island of Lesbos, where thousands of those fleeing fighting and

SPANISH MUSLIM STUDENT WINS FIGHT TO STUDY WITH VEIL

MADRID: A Spanish Muslim student whose ban from a training institute for wearing the headscarf caused controversy said yesterday she had finally been allowed to study with the hijab after regional authorities weighed in.

While the issue has been a subject of debate in Spain, there is currently no law banning any kind of veil in public places-not even the face-covering burka or niqab like in neighboring France.

The exclusion of Takwa Rejeb from class generated unease in a country where Muslims represent around four percent of the 46.5-million-strong population. "I am more than happy because the only thing I wanted was to exercise my right to study," said Rejeb, 23, born in the eastern city of Valencia from Tunisian parents. "I am not a circus freak, I'm a person like any other, a student," she told AFP.

The anti-discrimination SOS Racisme association brought Rejeb's case to light after she was refused access to lessons at the Benlliure pro-

fessional training institute in Valencia on September 8.

According to lawyer Francisco Solans, the association's regional president, the institute had asked her to apply internal rules that ban any student from coming in "with their head covered", be it a cap, hat or headscarf.

Management at the institute refused to comment yesterday. Faced with the controversy sparked by her case, the regional government of Valencia forced the institute to allow Rejeb in.

In a statement, it said education authorities had "guaranteed the right to education of students and she will be able to go to all lessons with the hijab." Solans told AFP it was a "victory for the recognition of constitutional freedoms and rights-freedom of expression, freedom of religion as long as public order is respected, the right to education and to equality."

He said there had also been similar cases elsewhere "that were resolved through mediation." — AFP

GERMANY CHARGES MAN WITH SPYING FOR INDIAN INTELLIGENCE

BERLIN: German authorities say they are charging a 58-year-old German citizen with espionage for allegedly passing confidential information to an Indian intelligence agency.

Federal prosecutors say the man, identified only by the initials T.S.P. in line with German privacy laws, worked at a local government office dealing with

immigrants in the western state of North Rhine-Westphalia. Prosecutors said in a statement Tuesday that the man used his access to government files to obtain and transmit information about "extremist Sikhs" and Indian opposition figures in Germany to the unidentified Indian agency. The man has been detained since his arrest on Feb. 17. — AP

FIVE WAYS INDIA COULD RESPOND TO PAKISTAN OVER KASHMIR RAID

Minister Narendra Modi is under pressure to act against Pakistan after Sunday's attack on an army base in divided Kashmir killed 18 soldiers. The army blamed the raid-the worst on troops for over a decade in the region-on Pakistan-based militant group Jaish-e-Mohammad. But experts say assuaging public anger should not come at the cost of a dangerous military escalation with a nuclear-armed neighbor. Here are five possible responses:

Air strikes and covert ops

Politicians, army veterans and others have called for a muscular response, including air strikes on training camps on the Pakistan side of the de facto border that divides Kashmir between the two countries. But analysts say India lacks the military capabilities to take on its neighbor, has not carried out such strikes before and runs the risk of triggering a full-scale war. "India knows it can't sustain a 15-day war against Pakistan and Pakistan knows it can't

Some say India could carry out covert operations across the border, known as the Line of Control, to attack guerrilla training camps. "India has special forces deployed in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir... India should and definitely will use them this time," said Ajit Dubey, a defense correspondent at The Week magazine.

Increase border security

As India mulls its options, Indian and Pakistani troops exchanged fire on Tuesday across their heavily militarized border. The two sides regularly fire across the border, breaching a ceasefire agreed in 2003. There have been calls for India to boost border troop numbers, who could shell Pakistan positions with heavy mortar fire and target their artillery. This runs the risk of retaliation and further weakens the ceasefire. "This ceasefire is going to be a victim, even if for a short period, it will be violated

Diplomatic isolation

For decades India has tried to persuade the US and other allies to isolate Pakistan as a "terrorist state" until it cracks down on militancy on its soil, but without much success. Modi at a recent G20 summit described Pakistan as the "one single nation" responsible for spreading "agents of terror" in South Asia. Commentators say the latest attack gives him a fresh chance to try to make Pakistan an outcast. India's foreign minister is said to be preparing evidence of Pakistan's complicity in the latest attack to present at the UN General Assembly. "There will be an attempt to isolate Pakistan in the international community and now it has become a bit easier for India to do so," Dubey said. Local media suggested India could also take steps to recall its high commissioner (ambassador) to Pakistan.

Balochistan card

India has long tacitly supported the people of

Pakistan's resource-rich Balochistan province, hit by a separatist insurgency and sectarian violence. But in a highly unusual move, Modi publicly referred to Balochistan's struggles and expressed support for its people in his August Independence Day speech.

Experts say now is the best time for Modi to ramp up pressure on Pakistan over Balochistan's freedom struggle. "We're going to see the intensity go up in a big way," Dubey said, a day after an exiled Balochistan activist expressed a desire to seek asylum in India.

Economic sanctions

Experts say India can lobby to have economic sanctions imposed on Pakistan, similar to the ones the US enforced on Iran. But the impact would be minimal unless India convinced numerous countries to follow suit, since its own trade with Pakistan is minimal. "India alone imposing economic sanctions will hardly make any difference," the New Indian Express said. — AFP

INDIA COURT ASKS GOVERNMENT TO **RESPOND TO ITALIAN MARINE'S PLEA**

NEW DELHI: India's top court has directed the government to respond to an Italian marine's plea to continue to stay in Italy during arbitration over the 2012 fatal shootings of two Indian fishermen in which he and a fellow marine are implicated.

The government's legal representative told the court yesterday that it had no objection to Massimiliano Latorre's request to remain in Italy pending the decision of the arbitration court in The Hague, Netherlands. The Supreme Court said the government must file its response by Sept. 28. Latorre has been in Italy since 2014 for medical treatment after suffering a stroke in India. India has accused Latorre and Salvatore Girone of killing the two fishermen in Indian waters while they were assigned to anti-piracy duties aboard an Italian commercial ship. —AP

INDIAN, PAKISTANI TROOPS EXCHANGE FIRE IN KASHMIR

FIRST SINCE SUNDAY'S ATTACK

SRINAGAR: Indian and Pakistani troops exchanged fire across their disputed border in Kashmir yesterday, two days after a deadly raid on an army base that New Delhi blamed on Pakistan-based militants.

Eighteen soldiers died in Sunday's attack, which was the worst of its kind to hit the divided Himalayan region in more than a decade and has increased hostility between the nucleararmed neighbors. Indian army spokesman Colonel Rajesh Kalia said there had been a "ceasefire violation" near Uri, where Sunday's attack took place, but gave no details.

Uri is near the Line of Control (LoC) which divides the disputed territory. "Small-arms exchange of fire is on in the area," a senior police officer told AFP on condition of anonymity. Separately, Kalia said troops in the same area had blocked an attempt by suspected militants to cross the LoC into Indian-administered Kashmir. "A group of 10-12 terrorists attempted to infiltrate the Uri sector. They were intercepted and the infiltration bid was foiled," he told AFP.

The Press Trust of India news agency said 10 suspected militants had been killed in the incident but this could not immediately be confirmed. India regularly accuses its arch-rival of arming and sending rebels across the heavily militarized border that divides Kashmir between the two countries, to launch attacks on its forces. Occasional violations of a 2003 ceasefire between the nuclear-armed rivals are not

uncommon. The last was reported on

September 6 this year and caused no casualties. Tuesday's exchange was the first since Sunday's attack, which the Indian army has blamed on Pakistan-based militant group Jaish-e-Mohammad. The same group was implicated in an audacious assault on an Indian air force base in Pathankot in the northern state of Puniab in January. It left seven soldiers dead and dashed hopes of a revival of peace talks, which have

been on ice ever since. The death toll from Sunday's attack in which gunmen hurling grenades stormed a base was particularly high at 18, and Prime Minister Narendra Modi has vowed to punish those responsible. Modi promised during his election campaign to take a hard line over Kashmir and has faced calls from army veterans-and even some in his own party-for military action against Pakistan. — AFP

TWO KILLED IN CLASHES OVER EVICTIONS NEAR WILDLIFE PARK IN EASTERN INDIA

MUMBAI: Two people were killed and about 20 injured in the eastern Indian state of Assam, when protesters clashed with police over evictions of encroachers around a wildlife park.

About 300 families in the buffer zone of Kaziranga National Park were asked to leave their homes after the state high court ordered evictions to help prevent poaching of the onehorned rhinoceros.

Police said they fired in the air and burst teargas shells on Monday when they were pelted with stones by protesters. "We have been residing in this area for decades, and all of a sudden the government told us to vacate," said Rafiq Ali, a community leader in Banderdubi village, one of the three villages that was ordered to be cleared. "The security forces fired at us," he said.

Scarcity of land has brought the competing needs of wildlife and humans into conflict across India, where land is increasingly sought for development and industrial projects.

The 430 sq km (166 sq mile) Kaziranga park is home to the world's largest concentration of the onehorned rhinoceros. Security personnel used excavators and elephants to mow down settlers' mud huts about 200 km (125 miles) from Guwahati city, activists said.

The villagers said they had not been offered adequate compensation by the

state for relocating. "The government has promised to provide financial compensation within 30 to 40 days of vacating the area," said Assam Finance Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma. "The violent resistance from the encroachers was unwarranted," he told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

Activists and opposition parties said the state should have paid the settlers compensation first.

"The government should have first provided compensation before asking them to leave," Tarun Gogoi, former Assam chief minister and leader of the opposition Congress party, said. "This is nothing but a gross rights violation," he said. —Reuters

SMALL BOMBS GO OFF OUTSIDE 2 NEPAL SCHOOLS; NO INJURIES

KATHMANDU: Small bombs exploded outside two schools in Nepal's capital yesterday morning, but no injuries and only minor damage were reported, officials said. Unexploded bombs were found at five other schools in the city.

The explosions took place outside the gates of two schools for students from grades 1 to 10, said police official Bikram Singh Thapa. The unexploded devices found in front of five other schools in Kathmandu were either schools' gates. Security and police detonated or removed.

Police arrested two people suspected of being behind the blasts, Thapa said. Police found pamphlets near the blast sites and attached to the unexploded devices from a littleknown group demanding free education for all Nepalese children.

Thapa said that no injuries were reported, and that the explosions caused minor damage to the

surveillance were stepped up around schools in Kathmandu. School officials were to meet later yesterday with government education officials to discuss the attacks.

While education is mostly free in Nepal's public schools, the teachers are poorly paid and the infrastructure is substandard, leading most children in the cities to attend private schools. — AP

US, CHINA TO STEP UP COOPERATION ON N KOREA

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang agreed on Monday to step up cooperation in the United Nations Security Council and in law-enforcement channels after North Korea's fifth nuclear test, the White House said. China and the United States are also targeting the finances of Liaoning Hongxiang Industrial, a Chinese conglomerate headed by a Communist Party cadre, that the Obama administration thinks has a role in assisting North Korea's nuclear program, the Wall Street Journal reported on Monday.

UN diplomats say the two countries have started discussions on a possible UN sanctions resolution in response to the nuclear test earlier this month, but Beijing has not said directly whether it will support tougher steps against North Korea.

Obama met Li on the sidelines of the annual United Nations General Assembly session in New York. "Both leaders condemned North Korea's September 9 nuclear test and resolved to strengthen coordination in achieving the denuclearization of the Korean Peninsula, including by invigorating cooperation in the United Nations Security Council and in law enforcement channels on North Korea," a White House statement said.

China is isolated North Korea's most important diplomatic backer and its biggest trading partner. It

NEW YORK: US President Barack Obama and has been angered by Pyongyang's repeated nuclear and missile tests and signed on to increasingly tough UN sanctions, but it has said it believes such steps are not the ultimate answer and called for a return to talks with North Korea.

Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi told his Japanese counterpart last week China opposes "unhelpful" unilateral sanctions on North Korea but will work within the United Nations to formulate a response. Washington has pressed Beijing to do more to rein in North Korea. The United States has said it is willing to negotiate with the North if the country commits to get rid of its nuclear weapons, which Pyongyang has refused to do.

Hongxiang probe

The US Department of Justice (DoJ) is preparing as early as this week to announce legal action against Chinese firms suspected of providing financial assistance to Pyongyang, the Journal reported, citing officials familiar with the matter.

It said DoJ prosecutors visited Beijing twice last month to make their Chinese counterparts aware of alleged criminal activities being committed by Liaoning Hongxiang Industrial. A social media post last week for the police in Liaoning, the northeastern border province of China, said they were inves-

tigating the firm's alleged long-term involvement in "serious economic crimes" and that relevant suspects were cooperating. A report by Asan Institute for Policy Studies in Seoul and C4ADS in Washington says it identified more than \$500 million in trade from January 2011 to September 2015 between the North and the Liaoning Hongxiang Group, which states on its website that it trades heavily with the North.

The figure includes more than \$360 million in imports from North Korea by one group company, Dandong Hongxiang Industrial Development Co., an industrial machinery and equipment wholesaler. "While no judgment is being made on the final use of these funds, trade at this volume is of particular note. By one estimate, this amount would have been almost enough to both fund North Korea's uranium enrichment facilities, and to design, make and test its nuclear weapons," the report said.

Certain assets related to the company, its founder and top executive Ma Xiaohong, and some of her relatives and associates, have been frozen by Chinese authorities in recent weeks, according to government and corporate filings cited by the Journal. The Asan report said its trading of goods that could qualify as potential military and nuclear dual-use products under US export restrictions were of particular concern. The products have possible use in a nuclear program, particularly the uranium enrichment program. The companies identified have had dealings with sanctioned North Korean entities, the report said. Chang Yong-seok, senior researcher at the Institute for Peace and Unification Studies, Seoul National University, said this case was symbolic and could have real practical impact. "This was the US taking China into consideration and working with China. More such cases may follow if the US or South Korea have firm evidence Chinese companies that have capacity for producing or securing goods for North Korea may be worried now," he said. Representatives of the US Department of Justice, Chinese Government and Hongxiang Industrial were unavailable for comment. The Liaoning Hongxiang Group is also heavily involved in North Korea-related shipping, with Ma and other people associated with the group owning and operating a combined fleet of 10 ships that regularly sail between the North and China. Ma, who served on Liaoning's People's Congress before resigning at the weekend, is described by Chinese media as the most successful businessperson in Dandong involved in cross-border trade with North Korea. Government records say Ma's investment in Hongxiang was frozen on Sept. 2. — Reuters

IN ZIMBABWE, COMEDY THRIVES AS COUNTRY SLOWLY FALLS APART

HARARE, Zimbabwe: Zimbabwe's economy is falling apart, and police are cracking down on growing anti-government protests. But the country's comedy scene is booming. No subject seems taboo.

Even 92-year-old President Robert Mugabe, widely accused of muzzling free speech, is a target. Insulting the president can bring a one-year jail term in this southern African country. Nonetheless, the comedians carry on, becoming bolder as fears of speaking out begin to erode.

In one skit at a show on Thursday called "State of the Nation," an actor playing the first lady, 51-year-old Grace Mugabe, lays her stake to the presidency on hearing the news of the "death" of her husband, the world's oldest head of state. "I deserve it. Were any of you cleaning his nappy and wiping the spit off his chin?" she says. She also talks up her own chances of winning elections. "We have always won, even when I was pushing the old man in a wheelbarrow," she says, a reference to the real first lady's comment at a political rally last year: "I will push President Mugabe in the wheelbarrow to bring him to work." Near the end, a fake Mugabe emerges, struggling to walk while scoffing at rumors of his demise. Some in the audience laugh. Others gasp. The real president has joked at the persistent rumors, telling reporters earlier this month: "It is true that I was dead. And I resurrected. As I always do." The comedy show played to a packed audience in the capital, Harare. "State of the Nation" will be a twice-monthly show streaming live on internet, said organizer Davis Guzha, director of Rooftop Promotions. "Comedy allows us to laugh but also to think about our problems at the same time," said Sam Monro, or Comrade

Fatso, a stand-up comedian who runs Zambezi News, a satirical social media show on current affairs. In everyday life, the state of this once-prosperous country's economy and politics is hardly a laughing matter. Government has failed to pay its close to 300,000 workers, including the military, on time since June. Industries are closing down, worsening unemployment where more than two-thirds of the population of 13 million survive on informal work, according to the African Development Bank. People line up for hours at banks to access their money as currency woes deepen.

The speculation over the health of Mugabe, this country's only leader since independence from white minority rule in 1980, has only heightened the uncertainty. Near daily anti-government protests are

NORTH KOREA'S KIM GUIDES NEW ROCKET ENGINE TEST, CALLS FOR SATELLITE LAUNCH

Test seen as result of cooperation with Iran

SEOUL: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un supervised a ground test of a new rocket engine to launch satellites, the North's state media reported yesterday, the latest in a rapid succession of missile-related tests this year by the isolated state. Kim asked scientists and engineers to make "preparations for launching the satellite as soon as possible on the basis of the successful test," the official KCNA news agency said, indicating the North may soon launch another longrange rocket.

The test was conducted amid global condemnation of the North's fifth nuclear test earlier this month and a call by the United States, Japan and South Korea this week for greater pressure on Pyongyang over its disregard for United Nations resolutions banning missile and nuclear programs. North Korea has been testing nuclear weapons and ballistic missiles at an unprecedented rate this year under Kim's direction, including the launch of a satellite in February that was widely seen as a test of long-range ballistic missile technology.

The North's Rodong Sinmun newspaper carried photographs of Kim on a podium overlooking the vertical test stand that housed a rocket engine which blasted a column of flame. A spokesman for South Korea's military, Jeon Hagyu, saidit was likely to have been a test for a new engine that can be used for a long-range missile. A satellite image dated Sept. 17 provided to Reuters by 38 North, a Washington-based website devoted to analysis of North Korea, showed preparations for an engine test, including a heavy crane over the vertical engine test stand and a shelter that would house the rocket engine. "This test is another important development pointing to the first launch of a bigger, better space vehicle to place satellites in higher orbits, which could happen in the not too distant future," said Joel Wit, founder of the 38 North website.

CHINA SAYS FIRST SUSPECT BACK FROM FRANCE UNDER EXTRADITION PACT

BEIJING: China said yesterday it had secured the return of a corruption suspect from France, the first such case since the two countries signed an extradition treaty that took effect in 2015.

Chen Wenhua, wanted for economic crimes by the public security bureau in the eastern province of Zhejiang, was returned last week thanks to assistance from France and the Chinese embassy in Paris, foreign ministry spokesman Lu Kang told a regular briefing. "It's a major breakthrough in this area and is another successful example of repatriating criminals from European countries, after Italy and Spain," he said. "In the future we will intensify our efforts, improve our legal system, and improve this Skynet so that it can reach to every corner of the world," he added. "Operation Skynet" is a multi-agency effort to bring back corruption suspects from abroad.

Chen fled to France in March 2013 after being accused of embezzling more than 20 million yuan (\$3 million) in public funds between 2009 and 2012, the official Xinhua news agency said, citing Zhejiang police.

In 2014 Chinese police approved his arrest and Interpol issued a red notice for him, it added, saying that French police apprehended him last year.

Since becoming party chief in 2012, President Xi Jinping has carried out a muchpublicized anti-corruption drive. Its highestprofile victim was the once-hugely powerful security chief Zhou Yongkang, who was sentenced to life in prison. Critics say the campaign may be partially politically motivated and used as a tool in internal faction-fighting.

Operation Skynet expanded the campaign to corruption suspects overseas, where Chinese police say they have found 409 fugitives, according to Xinhua.

The attempt to track overseas fugitives has had a mixed reaction from foreign governments. Media reports say Chinese agents have raised hackles by unilaterally pursuing suspects abroad.—AFP

Asked about the investigation during a regular press briefing, China's foreign ministry spokesman Lu Kang said that "relevant departments in China are handling and investigating this case", but would not confirm whether there was a connection to Pyongyang's nuclear program. CHINESE MEN JAILED IN CAMBODIA FOR 55 KILOGRAMS DRUG HAUL

PHNOM PENH: A Cambodian court sentenced two Chinese nationals and a local man to life in prison yesterday for trafficking 55 kilograms (121 pounds) of methamphetamine and heroin, one of the country's biggest drug seizures.

The two Chinese men-Ly Yong, 43, and Deng Yuan Ping, 53 — were arrested in June last year alongside a Cambodian couple after a police raid uncovered the drugs worth an estimated \$3 million. The heroin and meth were smuggled from the Golden Triangle-the region along the borders of Myanmar, Thailand and Laos which remains a major global drug production hub.

They were destined for the market both in Cambodia and abroad, police said. Judge Pech Vicheathor at Phnom Penh Municipal Court found the two Chinese and the local man

quilty both of producing and trafficking drugs. The trio were also fined a total of 180 million riel (\$45,000). The Cambodian man's girlfriend was also jailed for five years and fined six million riel (\$1,500) for her involvement.

Another Cambodian man, who remains at large, was sentenced to life imprisonment in his absence. Cambodia has become a popular smuggling route for narcotics, particularly methamphetamine and heroin, since neighboring Thailand toughened its stance on illegal drugs in the early 2000s. Cambodia has intensified its war on drugs in recent years and there have been hundreds of arrests, some involving senior officials. Last year police uncovered nearly 1.5 tons of marijuana worth more than \$7 million packed into coffee bags. —AFP

environments more extreme than anything found in Nature. That includes being plunged into scalding liguids or frozen at temperatures just shy of absolute zero. In an earlier experiment, water bears were given a 26hour bath in - 253 degree Celsius (-423 degree Fahrenheit) liquid nitrogen. The deepest chill ever recorded on Earth was a relatively balmy -89.2 C in Antarctica. All it took was a few drops of water for the critters to spring back to life.

And it gets better. Some tardigrade species - there are about 1,000 in all - can handle crushing pressure at least six times greater than found at the 11-km deep Mariana Trench in the Pacific Ocean. Even the ravages of outer space don't seem to faze them. In 2007, thousands of water bears, attached to a satellite, were exposed directly to potentially-deadly space radiation in vacuum conditions and then brought back to Earth. Not only did many survive, some females later laid eggs which yielded healthy offspring.

To survive extreme conditions, water bears can also slip into a state of suspended animation in which they lose almost all the liquid in their tiny bodies, and metabolism slows to 10,000 times below the normal rate. Scientists still do not know how they do all this. Most research has concluded that water bears have a heightened capacity to repair damaged DNA, especially

as they emerge from a state of extreme dessication, which can last for decades.

However, in their experiments with human cells, Hashimoto and colleagues found the tardigrade's Dsup protein could also "work as a kind of physical shield to protect DNA" -especially from X-ray harm. The findings were published in the scientific journal Nature Communications. The results may resolve a controversy that erupted after another team of researchers published the first complete genome of a tardigrade - from the species Ramazzottius hypsibius - last December in the US Proceeding of the National Academy of Sciences.

That study had found that nearly a fifth of the species' DNA had been obtained from other plants and animals, a new record in the animal kingdom for socalled horizontal gene transfer between species. This, they hypothesised, accounted for the remarkable resistance of water bears. Almost immediately, other scientists speculated that the high percentage of foreign DNA found was more likely the result of sample contamination

Hashimoto's results suggest the critics were right. His team sequenced the genome of a different species, R. varieoranatus - thought to be the hardiest of all tardigrades - with a precision 100 times greater, and found that foreign genes accounted for only 1.2 percent. "This suggests that horizontal gene transfer is not a major cause of tolerability," said Hashimoto. — AFP

It said an investigation would still be needed to confirm why the distress signal was pressed. "Appropriate penalties and sanctions will be imposed on the erring pilot if the result is indeed a human error," it said. There were 410 passengers on board plus four pilots and 17 crew members, airport general manager Ed Monreal told reporters. Many of them were returning from the annual hajj pilgrimage in Saudi Arabia.

One of the passengers, Aida Majud, said they were not told why they were being kept on the plane. "When we saw the armed men we thought, what's the

problem? We wanted to know what was happening," Majud told ABS-CBN television network. But she said the atmosphere was calm, with some speculating President Rodrigo Duterte had come to the airport to welcome the pilgrims home and that the armed men surrounding the plane were his security personnel.

Majud said passengers had to undergo body checks after getting off the plane to ensure no one was carrying weapons. Airport officials said there were no major disruptions to traffic, with planes continuing to land and take off, because the Saudia aircraft had been kept at an isolated area. The carrier is known as Saudia. — AFP



PAPERLESS VOTING MACHINES WIDESPREAD IN US

ne in four registered voters in the United States live in areas that will use electronic voting machines that do not produce a paper backup in the November presidential election despite concerns that they are vulnerable to tampering and malfunctions, according to a Reuters analysis. The lack of a paper trail makes it impossible to independently verify that the aging touch-screen systems are accurate, security experts say, in a year when suspected Russian hackers have penetrated political groups and state voting systems and Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump has said the election may be "rigged."

Election officials insist the machines are reliable, but security experts say they are riddled with bugs and security holes that can result in votes being recorded incorrectly. A Reuters analysis of data from the US Census Bureau, the Election Assistance Commission and the Verified Voting Foundation watchdog group found that 44 million registered voters, accounting for 25 percent of the total, live in jurislictions that rely on paperless systems, including millions in contested states such as Georgia, Pennsylvania and Virginia. The picture has improved gradually since the 2008 presidential election, when 31 percent of US voters lived in areas that used paperless touch-screen systems. In 2012, 27 percent lived in jurisdictions that used paperless systems. "Clearly we still have a long way to go to ensure that all Americans have access to a form of voting technology they can trust," said Alex Halderman, a University of Michigan computer-science professor who has helped to uncover security flaws on touch-screen systems. Most of these machines are nearing the end of their expected life span, making them more vulnerable to problems. And Congress has not authorized money for upgrades since 2002, just after the disputed 2000 presidential recount battle in Florida highlighted flaws in aging punch-card and lever-voting systems. In some

states, a divide has emerged between poorer areas that continue to use paperless touch-screen systems and wealthier areas that have bought new optical scan systems that process paper ballots, which many experts say are a better way to ensure accurate elections.

In Virginia, for example, counties that still use touch-screen systems have a poverty rate of 23 percent, while those that have switched to optical-scan systems have an average poverty rate of 11 percent. "I would have liked to have had the new machines, but the county says we don't have the money," said Patsy Burchett, the top election official in rural Lee County, which has been hit hard by the decline of the coal and tobacco industries and is the poorest county in the state. "These machines are on their last legs," she said.

Questionable Results

US election officials have known about the shortcomings of touch-screen systems since shortly after they were widely adopted in the early 2000s, when researchers showed that vote results could be manipulated with tools as simple as a magnet and a Palm Pilot-style handheld device. The systems have produced questionable results in some elections. In Florida, more than 18,000 iVotronic machines did not record a vote in a 2006 congressional race in which the margin of victory was less than 400 votes. In Fairfax County, Virginia, electronic machines subtracted one vote for every hundred cast for one candidate in a 2003 school-board race. More than 4,400 electronic ballots in Carteret County, North Carolina, were lost and never recovered in the 2004 presidential election. Since 2008, states such as Maryland have traded in their touch-screen machines for optical-scan systems. Others like California and Ohio have added printers to their touch-screen machines which produce a backup paper trail, while Washington and Colorado moved to mail-in ballots. Absentee balloting is also cutting into the use of paperless systems. In 2012, for example, roughly 1 in 10 voters who lived in areas that used paperless systems cast absentee ballots.

Election officials say the touch-screen machines that remain in use are more secure now than they were a decade ago whether they are fitted with printers or not, thanks to extensive testing and better pollworker training. They say that a hacking incident is unlikely because the machines are not connected to the Internet.

"Voters should have confidence in whatever systems are being used in their jurisdiction because election officials have taken the necessary steps to secure these systems and ensure the integrity of the process," said Matthew Masterson, a commissioner with the US Election Assistance Commission. Although there has so far been no confirmed major incident of US voting machines being hacked, security experts say that those aiming to manipulate votes could spread a virus through memory cards, with no Internet connection needed. The best way to stop that is to switch to paper-based systems, they say.

With 55 percent of all US registered voters living in areas that use systems that are no longer in production, according to the Reuters analysis, election offi-

However, there was some dissent within German media. Eyes on Bavaria

Much depends on whether Merkel's contrition will win over her critics in the CSU, focused more squarely on their party's performance on its Bavarian home turf than on national politics. Senior CSU lawmaker Stephan Mayer told broadcaster NDR that Merkel's comments were a "very important and welcome signal" showing she had understood popular concerns, adding the two parties were on the path of reconciliation.

But CSU boss Horst Seehofer was lukewarm, saying voters did not want backward-looking apologies, but actions. The influx of migrants has already slowed from the million who entered Germany last year and is estimated to be nearer 300,000 this year. Lacking fresh federal funds, some states have opted to upgrade on their own. Louisiana aims to switch to an iPad-based system by 2019, while Los Angeles and Austin, Texas, are designing systems from scratch. Others see no reason to switch. In Georgia, Secretary of State Brian Kemp said he hasn't asked the state legislature for money to replace its fleet of paperless AccuVote TS touch-screen machines. "It's working just fine and all these so-called experts that are making these accusations about our system haven't seen it," he said. —Reuters

QUESTIONING STEREOTYPES ABOUT NORTH KOREA

orth Korea is an economic basket case that incomprehensively pours resources into nuclear weapons and cares only about enriching a tiny circle of elites when it can't even feed its own people. It's an "impossible state," as one former US diplomat put it, bound to collapse under the weight of its own failed policies, if just given a push. Common sense, right? We've all heard those descriptions thrown around in the media, from the White House, from the UN Security Council. But with North Korea facing yet more sanctions and punitive measures over its latest nuclear test, now might be a good time to reexamine those assumptions.

They aren't as solid as they might seem.

Kim Jong Un is Crazy, Erratic, Incompetent

Ridicule is a comforting way of letting off steam. But regardless of how morally reprehensible, criminal or even evil we may perceive an adversary to be, underestimation is dangerous. There is little evidence Kim is crazy, erratic or incompetent. He assumed power after the death of his father, Kim Jong II, with very little preparation and probably while still in his late 20s. Yet there are no clear indications he - or a circle of power-holding cadres acting in his name - is not solidly in power.

In a totalitarian dictatorship, balancing rival interest groups and keeping popular unrest at bay in itself is no small feat. It is to be expected that Kim would face potential challenges, but he appears to be navigating the balance of power quite deftly - and ruthlessly, if necessary. The biggest known challenge to his power came early, and he dealt with it by executing his powerful uncle and former mentor, and purging his followers. That, apparently, was that. Policy wise, Kim's regime has been consistent. His stated goals have been to develop the country's nuclear weapons arsenal while improving its standard of living.

In terms of lost trade opportunities, sanctions and diplomatic isolation, North Korea's pursuit of a viable nuclear arsenal is a costly endeavor. It also uses resources that could be put toward badly needed infrastructure improvements. The military calculus is different, however. North Korea is surrounded by nuclear powers. Two of them - Russia and China - are, to some degree, friendly. But the trump card is held by the US, and by extension Japan and South Korea, which are under the US nuclear umbrella. Washington can bomb North Korea into oblivion at will - as it nearly did with conventional weapons during the 1950-53 Korean War.

North Korea has long been able to keep South Korea at bay with its considerable artillery power near the Demilitarized Zone. But hitting the US mainland has always been out of its reach. A viable nuclear deterrent, as North Korea calls it, would change that. Going to the table as a nuclear power would radically boost the North's bargaining position should serious talks ever resume. This may seem like paranoia to some. The US has no intention of invading North Korea, and has said so for decades.

But every year, US troops team up with South Korean counterparts to conduct war games that, while always termed defensive in nature, have recently begun including training for precision strikes, or more colorfully, "decapitation" strikes on Kim Jong Un, along with scenarios for invading or destroying the capital. To North Korea, that is a very real threat. Threats, real or perceived, are also useful political tools. Few things rally a nation behind its leaders better than the fear of an attack - especially if the threat happens to be coming from the world's strongest military.

North Korea's Economy is a Basket Case

It faces severe international sanctions, is extremely wary of even the most basic forms of market capitalism and has a financial system that is, at best, skeletal. Still, North Korea's economy is growing, and has been for years. Economists, while working with admittedly flawed and incomplete data, largely agree things appear to have been getting marginally better. They estimate annual GNP growth at 1 to 3 percent. Sanctions have certainly hurt. But they have not been crippling.

Despite region-wide concern over a nuclear North Korea, trade with Russia and China continues and is unlikely to end, considering the reservations both Beijing and Moscow harbor toward toeing any policy line that they feel is dictated by Washington. North Korea remains among the world's least developed economies. Stunting due to malnutrition, abject poverty and the lack of economic options surely persist. But no more so than in many other poor nations.

The UN's World Food Program, which has an office in Pyongyang and conducts regular assessments, says North Korea's food situation is precarious. Most North Koreans can't count on a balanced, nutritious diet. But are North Koreans starving en masse? Are they on the WFP's list of nations most suffering from food emergencies ? No.

Its Regime Can't Survive

Repressive, totalitarian dictatorships do have a tendency to implode. When they do, it's usually a violent, bloody mess. And from the outside, it can seem to happen with amazing suddenness. That scenario could play out in North Korea. But it has defied the odds for nearly 70 years, under three different Kims. It survived the Korea War - which, thanks to massive Chinese help, ended in what is essentially a stalemate. It survived the fall of the Soviet Union and its Communist allies, major benefactors for decades.

Barring invasion, internal revolt or popular uprising, the biggest threat the regime faces could be a growing domestic consumer economy that arose as a coping mechanism during the famine years that followed the Soviet collapse and the capitalism-friendly transformation of China's economy. When North Korea stopped being able to provide necessities its people had come to rely on, they learned to fend for themselves. That helped North Korea weather the crisis, but also created a cash-based, entrepreneurial economy that continues to grow - and not necessarily in a way the regime can control. But, then again, maybe it can. — AP

But Russia took control in the second period, scoring four goals through Vladislav Namestnikov, Nikita Kucherov, Evgeny Kuznetsov and Vladimir Tarasenko to power into a 4-1 lead. Morgan Rielly pulled a goal back for North America, but it was too little too late. — AFP

UNDERFIRE KENYAN OLYMPIC BOARD WARNS OF STALEMATE

NAIROBI: The underfire Kenyan National Olympic Committee (NOCK) yesterday warned it faced imminent suspension from the IOC if the government failed to honour an agreement to reinstate it into office. The International Olympic Committee helped to broker a truce between the two parties in Lausanne last week, three weeks after Kenyan sports minister Hassan Wario announced he was disbanding the NOCK over their poor handling of the Olympic team in Rio de Janeiro.

The IOC ordered that NOCK, led by two-time Olympic gold medallist Kipchoge Keino, be allowed to continue in office to spearhead reforms and hold fresh elections before the end of the year.

But Keino has accused Wario of reneging on his pledge to re-open the NOCK offices, which were closed down by police to allow for investigations after four top officials were arrested for abuse of office and alleged theft of team uniforms.

"We have been trying to get in touch with the minister for the last two days but he does not want to talk to us. "Right now we cannot get access to even pay our debtors since the treasurer, Fridah Shiroya is still in court. We urgently require to pay for the workers to continue with our new office block, which is currently under construction," Keino told AFP.

"Unless this impasse is resolved immediately it might result in Kenya being banned for four years, and this will greatly have a negative impact on the youth of this country."

Four top NOCK officials including Shiroya and secretary general Francis Kinyili Paul are currently in court charged with the shambolic preparation and mismanagement of the team in Rio.

Despite turmoil at official level, the country's athletes clocked up their best Olympics yet with 13 medals (including six golds) putting them in 15th place overall, the best in Africa by far. — AFP

INDIA'S SHARMA OUT OF FIRST KIWI TEST WITH CHIKUNGUNYA

KANPUR: Indian pace bowler Ishant Sharma was yesterday ruled out of the first Test against New Zealand after contracting the mosquito-borne disease chikungunya.

"Ishant Sharma is recovering from chikungunya and will not be available for the first Test match," coach Anil Kumble told reporters in Kanpur, where the opening Test starts tomorrow. Kumble said a replacement has not been sought for Sharma in the 15-member squad that includes three other fast bowlers-Bhuvneshwar Mohammed Shami and Umesh Yadav. try so far this year. Twenty-eight-year old Sharma has taken 209 wickets from 72 Tests, with seven five-wicket hauls. The Aedes aegypti mosquito, which can carry the Zika, dengue and chikungunya viruses, is prevalent in India, and is most active during the monsoon season from June to September. Meanwhile, New Zealand allrounder Jimmy Neesham will miss the first Test against India with a rib injury, coach Mike Hesson said yesterday.

Hesson said Neesham suffered a blow during training last week which limited his involvement in the drawn tour game against Mumbai in New Delhi.

"Jimmy was struck in the nets and has been in discomfort the last few days," he said. "It will take a few days for the bruising to go away, but it's very much a shortterm injury." While Neesham is sidelined for the first Test beginning tomorrow in Kanpur, Hesson was confident he would return for the rest of the three-Test series.

The Blacks Caps have already lost strike bowler Tim Southee for the series with an injured ankle, calling in Matt Henry as a replacement. — AFP

TOKYO: Former champion Petra Kvitova stormed through her opening match at the Pan Pacific Open yesterday, beating American Madison Brengle 6-3, 6-3 in a flurry of swashbuckling winners.

The 26-year-old Czech, twice a Wimbledon winner, had too much firepower for Brengle in a match played under a closed roof due to typhoon rains in Tokyo. Seventh seed Kvitova will next play Rio Olympic gold medallist Monica Puig of Puerto Rico. Meanwhile, sixth seed Dominika Cibulkova of Slovakia overcame another Czech, Lucie Safarova, 4-6, 6-1, 7-5 to set up a second-round match with fast-rising Japanese teenager Naomi Osaka.

"I've seen her play a few times," Cibulkova said of Osaka. "She has a powerful serve and it's always tough playing against these young players-they are fearless and have nothing to lose." In other matches, Denmark's former world number one Caroline Wozniacki battled

to a 6-2, 5-7, 6-1 victory over Switzerland's Belinda Bencic. Elsewhere on a day badly affected by the weather, Latvia's Anastasija Sevastova beat Ukrainian Kateryna Bondarenko 7-6, 6-3 while Aliaksandra Sasnovich of Belarus overcame Belgium's Yanina Wickmayer 3-6, 6-3, 6-3.

In Beijing, defending champion Jelena Jankovic of Serbia sailed through her opening match at the WTA Guangzhou Open yesterday, joining German Sabine Lisicki in the second round. The 31-year-old former world number one eased past China's You Xiaodi 6-2, 6-1, while 2013 Wimbledon finalist Lisicki beat Kwan Yau Ng of Hong Kong 6-2, 6-0.

Rams, Miami Dolphins and Tennessee Titans protested during the anthem on Sunday, while Megan Rapinoe has also knelt during the anthem at the U.S. women's soccer team games. Other NFL players have chosen to raise fists, recalling a similar demonstration by athletes Tommie Smith and John Carlos during their medal ceremony at the 1968 Olympic Games in Mexico City.

The protesting players have been seen as allies of the Black Lives Matter movement, which grew in response to a string of high-profile police killings of unarmed African-Americans across the country. About two-thirds of NFL players are black.

Other athletes and fans have spoken out against the protests, viewing them as disrespectful. — Reuters

AUSTRALIA CALL UP YOUNG GUNS FOR SAUDI, JAPAN W CUP GAMES

SYDNEY: Austrian-based midfielder James Jeggo could earn his first cap for the Socceroos after being named yesterday in Australia's squad for World Cup qualifiers against Saudi Arabia and Japan next month.

Coach Ange Postecoglou has made three changes to the squad, calling up the uncapped Jeggo and Netherlands-based Craig Goodwin, while defender Bailey Wright returns after missing the first two qualifiers through injury.

Jeggo, 24, moved to SK Sturm Graz this year after stints with Melbourne Victory and Adelaide United in Australia's A-League. "We've made a couple of slight tweaks to the squad in line with our mantra of selecting players who are in form and fitness and we'd like to have a good look at Craig Goodwin and James Jeggo, who have started their seasons well in Europe," Postecoglou said.

"Bailey Wright also comes back in after he missed the first two matches through injury and we go to Saudi Arabia and then back to Melbourne with a squad we are comfortable can continue the good start we achieved."

Asian champions Australia defeated Iraq 2-0 in Perth and the United Arab Emirates 1-0 in Abu Dhabi earlier this month to kick off their final round qualifying campaign for the 2018 World Cup in Russia.

They face Saudi Arabia, who beat Thailand and Iraq in their first two matches, in Jeddah on October 6 before returning to Melbourne on October 11 to play Japan.

LUIS ENRIQUE, SIMEONE UNITE TO DEFEND 'SPECTACULAR' NEYMAR

BARCELONA: Barcelona coach Luis Enrique and Atletico Madrid manager Diego Simeone have launched impassioned defences of Neymar after the Brazilian's showboating again came under the spotlight.

Former Barcelona great Michael Laudrup lambasted the Brazil international for "provoking" the opposition in Saturday's 5-1 win at Leganes and Neymar's flamboyant style will be scrutinised again on Wednesday when Barcelona host Atletico.

Commentating on Saturday's game at Leganes for BeIN sports, Laudrup said he understood why Lluis Sastre kicked out at Neymar during the game.

"Why are you taking the ball across your own half? You're provoking the opposition. When it's 4-0 you can't be showboating and provoking your opponents," Laudrup said.

Neymar's penchant for trying to embarrass opponents with flicks and tricks has prompted criticism in Spain before, with Luis Enrique once declaring he sympathised with Athletic Bilbao players for fouling Neymar in the 2015 King's Cup final.

The coach, however, took his player's side when questioned about Laudrup's comments. "He has his own style and I think it's spectacular for football. We enjoy his play a lot at Barca," Luis Enrique told a news conference yesterday. "We know what world we live in and what people focus on, but I like his concept of football, and no-one in La Liga can be surprised by it now.

"Perhaps it's better to criticise things that are against the rules, as there is nothing saying you cannot do spectacular tricks." Atletico coach Simeone also defended Neymar when asked if he would be bothered if Neymar attempted similar tricks against his side today. "He has a particular style of play, like everyone else, but I love it," Simeone said yesterday. "He has been criticised and they have exposed his private life. He has fun, he sings he dances and he destroys opponents. They can keep criticising him. He needs to respond on the pitch."

Simeone added: "He's extraordinary. He went to the Olympics and won gold, he has found his place at Barcelona to showcase his talent, he has just come back from holidays and he's still playing just as well. "He has a personality that allows him to do all that, and I love watching him." — Reuters

Wentz followed up an impressive NFL debut with another solid performance, throwing for 190 yards and a touchdown, and the Eagles beat the Chicago Bears 29-14 on Monday night. "It was a cool stage, Monday Night Football," Wentz said. "Everything's sweet. But again, it was a football game and we came out with a win."

The No. 2 overall pick, Wentz is delivering as advertised so far for the Eagles (2-0). He followed up a strong performance against Cleveland by completing 21 of 34 passes and playing turnover-free ball for the second straight game.

But it's one thing to do it against the rebuilding Browns and Bears. The schedule gets a little tougher next week when the Eagles host the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The Bears, meanwhile, are in danger of seeing their season slip away. Not only did they follow up a season-opening loss at Houston with a dismal performance, they lost quarterback Jay Cutler to a right thumb injury. With that in mind, here are some takeaways from the game.

HELPING WENTZ

The Eagles aren't getting much from their run game, but their defense sure is chipping in. After holding Cleveland to 10 points, that group gave up only one of Chicago's two touchdowns. "They're playing well together as a team," coach Doug Pederson said. "The communication is great. The defensive line is rolling off the ball, getting pressure, making the (opposing) quarterback move off one spot, having to relocate his feet, putting the quarterback in different throwing positions. "Then the back end is doing a really nice job in coverage. They're just playing together as a unit."

AT QUARTERBACK

The Bears lost the game and they lost their quarterback. If Cutler is not available, Brian Hoyer figures to start at Dallas next week. Cutler was seen having his right hand examined on the sideline early in the third following a strip-sack by Destiny Vaeao, though he said it happened sometime earlier in the game. That play just aggravated it.

As if the injury wasn't enough, he also got an earful from injured linebacker Pernell McPhee after an interception late in the third quarter. The two had words after a pass got picked off by Philadelphia's Nigel Bradham. Cutler walked to the locker room and did not return.

NO GROUND GAINS

The Bears are being hurt offensively by the lack of a running game, whether it's because of poor blocking with a line that has just come together or a lack of execution. Their running backs had just 55 yards on 17 carries after going for 61 on 18 attempts in a season-opening loss at Houston. "I mean, nothing has gotten going like we planned to," Cutler said. "That falls on me. That falls on the rest of the offense. So we've got to take a look at it and whatever is bothering us on offense we've got to get it fixed."

FALLEN CHELSEA HERO DIXON AIMS TO REBUILD HIS LIFE

LONDON: Four months in jail, 10 years of drug abuse, two bankruptcies and hundreds of thousands of pounds blown on gambling are not the figures Kerry Dixon wants to be remembered for but the former Chelsea and England striker is determined to rebuild his life and reputation.

Dixon notched four goals in his eight England appearances and as Chelsea's third-highest scorer with 193 he is still worshipped by fans who have a deep fondness for those who loyally served in the years before Roman Abramovich's takeover.

However, the striker's life spiralled out of control after retirement from the game and hit rock bottom when he was involved in a fight with a man in a pub that led to him being found guilty of actual bodily harm in June 2015 and sentenced to nine months in prison.

Dixon was released after four months and, having lost the hospitality and media jobs he had at his beloved Chelsea, is trying to rebuild his life by working as a labourer.

"I'm going to be remorseful for the rest of my days," Dixon told Reuters in an interview. "I'm sorry it happened but I'm drawing a line underneath it and trying to move forward.

"I've done my time for the crime I committed. I was never sent off in my career and I was booked only five times in 17 years so violence is not my thing.

"The judge saw it as a vicious assault and I've got to live with that," said Dixon. "But I don't believe you should be provoked by people in public that you don't know. If you've got nothing nice to say to someone then don't say anything at all."

The time he spent in prison certainly provided a salutary lesson for Dixon. "I was in my cell for 16 hours a day and the boredom, the inactivity, the loss of privileges, the whole package, made me realise l've got more to offer life than this," said the 55year-old. "I'm not going to say I'm a totally changed person. I still have a drink and I still meet people but I won't put myself in a position where I see rowdiness and sense things may kick off. "I was quite comfortable in those situations before. Now I tend to say to whoever I'm with, 'Come on, let's go somewhere else?"

One of the most harrowing experiences Dixon endured came within minutes of his sentencing.



SWEAT BOX

"I was put in a prison van and the worst part of the journey was the sweat box I had to squeeze into," he said. "Those vans contain a number of small compartments.

"My shoulders and knees touched the sides and I found it extremely oppressive, made worse by the heat. I started to have a panic attack...I felt like I was in a coffin.

"A dish of water was passed under the door and I gulped it down," said Dixon who has written a hard-hitting autobiography about his roller-coaster life entitled 'Up Front', by John Blake Publishing.

"As a means of transporting prisoners it was horrendous and in my opinion it should be changed, it is inhumane."

Dixon, a member of England's squad at the 1986 Mexico World Cup, received no special privileges in jail and discovered that boredom was the worst thing about his incarceration.

He had eight different cell mates and said the highlight of each day was the halfhour when the inmates were allowed to get some fresh air in the exercise yard.

"There was a suicide," Dixon added. "Someone hanged himself in his cell, went into a coma and could not be revived. I never knew the guy.

DEPTHS OF DEPRESSION

"When you are inside you appreciate the depths of depression that take hold. It's easy to slip into feelings of being unwanted and unloved, coupled with loneliness."

There have been several other moments in Dixon's life where he may have felt similar emotions. After his career with Chelsea, Southampton, Watford, Reading, Luton Town, Millwall and Doncaster Rovers ended, Dixon developed a drug habit that lasted for around a decade. "If I stayed up late drinking socially on a night out... I would take cocaine as part of the ritual," he said.

"Fortunately I have found the urge has died down in recent years. As I no longer have too many late nights, the need for cocaine hardly exists and I've managed to shake the habit off."

Dixon also has a string of failed business ventures behind him. He was made bankrupt twice and has lost three homes as a result of the chronic gambling addiction that first took hold when he was a teenager. At one point during his halcyon spell at Chelsea between 1983-92, his annual salary was 130,000 pounds (\$169,429) but he lost

TOURE WON'T PLAY UNTIL HE SAYS SORRY: GUARDIOLA

MANCHESTER: Yaya Toure will not play again for Manchester City until the player's camp apologises for comments made by his agent, manager Pep Guardiola vowed yesterday.

Dimitri Seluk accused the City manager of "humiliating" Toure, 33, by leaving him out of the club's Champions League squad at the start of this month.

The Ivorian midfielder, who announced his retirement from international duty yesterday, has not figured in a single City match-day squad since then. "The day after that, his agent spoke and in that moment, Yaya is out," Guardiola told a press conference. "Unless Mr Dimitri Seluk comes back to the press or to his friends in the media-because he hasn't the courage to call me, he goes to the media-and apologises to Manchester City first of all, then his team-mates and afterwards the trainer... "When that happens, Yaya will be part of the group and he will have the chance to play."

Every couple of steps he is greeted by a fan who wants to hug him, shake his hand or simply tell him, 'You'll always be a legend here'. Dixon's ultimate aim is to re-establish himself with the hierarchy at Chelsea.

"Almost the first thing I did when I came out of prison was to make arrangements to see chairman Bruce Buck," he said. "I will always naturally gravitate toward Stamford Bridge. "I loved my job in the hospitality lounges, on Chelsea TV and as a pundit. Were I to be given a second chance back at the Bridge I would be sure not to let them down." — Reuters

ROONEY AT RISK AS JOSE'S MANCHESTER UNITED TOIL

LONDON: Manchester United manager Jose Mourinho is under pressure to drop Wayne Rooney, with the captain's clanking performances emblematic of the team's struggles. United have lost their last three matches and there is clamour among supporters and journalists for Rooney to be removed from the starting XI. In an online poll by the United fanzine Red Issue, over 99 percent of respondents called for him to be axed.

"Where do you want Wayne Rooney to play? Or should he be playing at all?" former England captain Alan Shearer wrote in The Sun after United's 3-1 defeat at Watford on Saturday.

"Not on yesterday's performance, it is fair to say." Despite United winning their first three league games, Rooney's lacklustre displays meant his place was already under scrutiny. With United having since lost to Manchester City, Feyenoord, in the Europa League, and Watford, the calls for him to be dropped are getting louder. Rooney, 30, was rested for last Thursday's trip to Feyenoord, but he has started all of United's other games under Mourinho. It was a similar story during Louis van Gaal's twoyear tenure as manager. The Dutchman sidelined Rooney only once, for a 2-0 defeat at Stoke City on Boxing Day last year.

David Moyes, Van Gaal's predecessor, was similarly faithful to the United number 10, whose career he launched at Everton. But Alex Ferguson lost patience with the England captain towards the end of his storied tenure.

Ferguson claimed Rooney had asked to leave the club for a second time in 2013 and he disappeared from view in the dying days of the Scot's 26-year reign. Mourinho, whose side host Leicester City on Saturday, has said he would have no qualms about dropping Rooney.

"I can take him out. No problem for me to take him out," Mourinho said following United's last-gasp 1-0 win at Hull City last month.

POGBA STIFLED

As has been the case for much of his career, debate continues to rage about Rooney's best

position. Never quite a true number nine, but not a classic number 10 either, Rooney was deployed in central midfield by Roy Hodgson during England's calamitous Euro 2016 campaign. Rooney has said he is open to the idea of moving into midfield as his career progresses. Mourinho appeared to nix that ambition, in the short term at least, prior to the season.

"For me, Wayne will be a number nine or a number 10 or a number nine-and-a-half," Mourinho said. "But with me he will never be a number six, not even a number eight."

Yet in the loss at Watford, Rooney started the game in a midfield three alongside Marouane Fellaini and record signing Paul Pogba. Once again he looked off the pace, even after moving into a number 10 role behind Zlatan Ibrahimovic in the second half. A 'highlights' video flagging up his sloppy touches and wayward passing circulated widely on social media.

"I think playing him as a number 10 is holding back United," former Arsenal defender Martin Keown said in the Daily Mail. A knock-on effect of Mourinho's deployment of Rooney as a number 10 is that several of his team-mates have been prevented from playing in their preferred positions. Teenage striker Marcus Rashford, last season's breakthrough star, started on the left wing against Watford. Juan Mata and close-season signing Henrikh Mkhitaryan, both more conventional number 10s, have had to content themselves with wide roles or places on the bench.

Perhaps most worryingly, in using a 4-2-3-1 system to accommodate Rooney at number 10 Mourinho has been fielding Pogba as a holding midfielder, denying him the freedom to attack that he thrived upon at Juventus. "Until they find the right balance, you won't see the best of Pogba," said Liverpool midfielder turned BBC pundit Danny Murphy.

Rooney needs only four goals to surpass Bobby Charlton's United scoring record of 249 goals, but his first-team status is more fragile than ever.— AFP

RED SOX USE TWO HRS TO BEAT ORIOLES

BALTIMORE: Rick Porcello pitched a four-hitter for his major league-high 21st victory while David Ortiz and Mookie Betts hit two-run homers as the Boston Red Sox beat the Baltimore Orioles 5-2 on Monday night to extend their lead in the American League East. Coming off a four-game sweep of the Yankees, Boston sustained its late-season surge in the opener of an important four-game series for both clubs. The Red Sox stand atop the division by a season-high four games. Adam Jones home-red and Mark Trumbo picked up his 102nd RBI, but the Orioles dropped into a tie with Toronto for the first AL wild card. Porcello (21-4) struck out seven and walked none in his third complete game of the year. Five days earlier against Baltimore, the right-hander gave up one run in eight innings but took the loss. Playing his final regular season series in Baltimore, the 40-year-old Ortiz connected against rookie Dylan Bundy (9-6) with a man on in the fifth for a 5-1 lead.

DODGERS 2, GIANTS 1

Adrian Gonzalez hit a game-ending double in the ninth inning as Los Angeles rallied for a testy 2-1 victory over San Francisco that increased its NL West lead to six games. Two innings after a shoving match broke out when tempers again flared between Madison Bumgarner and Yasiel Puig, the Dodgers' comeback in the ninth began with pinch-hitter Andrew Toles' leadoff single. Corey Seager singled past diving second baseman Joe Panik on a two-strike pitch from Javier Lopez (1-3), allowing the speedy Toles to reach third. Justin Turner's single tied the game, and Gonzalez followed with a drive to deep right field that eluded Hunter Pence. Joe Blanton (6-2) got the win in relief.

RANGERS 3, ANGELS 2

lan Desmond had an RBI single with no outs in the ninth inning as Texas moved closer to the AL West title. Elvis Andrus led off the ninth with a sharp single to left off Jose Alvarez (1-3) before Carlos Gomez turned an attempted sacrifice into a bunt single. Desmond, an All-Star center fielder, followed with his hit to right that scored Andrus. Andrus also homered for the Rangers, who cut their magic number to three in pursuit of their second consecutive division title. Alvarez, the sixth Angels pitcher, had got out of a bases-loaded jam in the eighth following a 38-minute rain delay. Closer Sam Dyson (3-2) worked a scoreless ninth for the victory.

BLUE JAYS 3, MARINERS 2

Marco Estrada took a no-hitter into the seventh inning and Edwin Encarnacion hit his 41st home run too lift Toronto over Seattle in the opener of a critical three-game series. Estrada (9-9) had allowed only two walks before Robinson Cano led off the seventh with a line drive up the middle on a 2-1 pitch. Cano and Nelson Cruz walked in the fourth inning, but Estrada otherwise kept the Mariners off the bases. The Blue Jays pulled even with Baltimore for the first AL wild-card spot. Both teams are 2 1/2 games clear of Detroit and three ahead of Seattle and Houston. Taijuan Walker (6-11) allowed three runs in 5 1/3 innings. Roberto Osuna got his 34th save.

CUBS 5, REDS 2

Dexter Fowler hit a tiebreaking single with two outs in the seventh inning as Chicago beat Cincinnati. Fowler's line drive into center field capped a three-run rally for the Cubs after they were shut down by Tim Adleman most of the night. It also made a winner of Jason Hammel (15-9), who pitched seven solid innings. Jason Heyward added a two-run homer in the eighth as the Cubs moved seven games ahead of Washington for the best record in the National League, lowering their magic number for clinching home-field advantage throughout the NL playoffs to five. That's the only major goal still out there during the regular season for major league-leading Chicago after it secured the NL Central title last week. Blake Wood (6-4) allowed three runs in 1 2/3 innings.

BRAVES 7, METS 3

Aaron Blair won for the first time in 13 major league starts, Freddie Freeman drove in three runs off a misfiring Noah Syndergaard and Atlanta slowed New York's wild-card chase. Freeman had four hits for the Braves, who have the worst record in the National League, and rookie Dansby Swanson had three hits and three RBIs. New York had won 11 of its previous 14 games. The Mets have a one-game lead over San Francisco and St. Louis for the first NL wild card. Pitching on five days' rest rather than four, Syndergaard (13-9) allowed five runs, eight hits and three walks in 3 2/3 innings. Blair (1-6) gave up six hits in six innings and lowered his ERA to 7.71.

CARDINALS 5, ROCKIES 3

Carlos Martinez threw five effective innings and added a two-run double, helping St. Louis gain ground in the NL playoff race. The Cardinals moved into a tie for the second wild card with the Giants. Martinez, who turns 25 on Wednesday, gave himself an early birthday present by holding Colorado to two runs while striking out six. The right-hander is 9-1 on the road this season. Martinez (15-8) helped his own cause with a two-out double as part of a three-run fourth. He also was hit just below the left leg by a fastball from Tyler Anderson (5-6) in the third - two pitches after Randal Grichuk lined a two-run homer.

ASTROS 4, ATHLETICS 2

Marwin Gonzalez hit a tiebreaking, two-run single off Ryan Madson in the ninth inning as Houston came from behind to beat Oakland. The Astros trailed 2-1 going into the eighth but tied it on pinch-hitter Tyler White's RBI double, then scored twice in the ninth to bolster their slim playoff hopes. Jose Altuve and Carlos Correa opened the inning with singles. After Evan Gattis was intentionally walked, Gonzalez lined the first pitch from Madson (5-7) into center field to drive in Altuve and Correa. Former Oakland reliever Luke Gregerson (4-1) retired three batters for the win. Ken Giles pitched the ninth for his 12th save.

MARLINS 4, NATIONALS 3

Giancarlo Stanton homered and Miami beat Washington. Christian Yelich, Ichiro Suzuki and Derek Dietrich also drove in a run for the Marlins and A.J. Ramos pitched the ninth for his 38th save in 41 chances. Brian Ellington (3-2) picked up the win with an inning of relief while Mat Latos (7-3) took the loss.

ROYALS 8, WHITE SOX 3

Yordano Ventura picked up his first complete-game victory, Kendrys Morales hit a three-run homer and Kansas City defeated Chicago. The Royals have won three straight, keeping their faint playoff hopes flickering with 12 games remaining. The Royals went 14-5 against the White Sox this year.

Ventura (11-11) gave up nine hits, struck out five and walked one. His only other complete game in the majors was a July 28 loss at Texas. Morales homered off Carlos Rodon (7-10) in a four-run fifth. FIVE CUBAN VOLLEYBALL PLAYERS JAILED FOR GANG RAPE IN FINLAND

HELSINKI: A Finnish court yesterday jailed five members of Cuba's national volleyball team for gang raping a woman during a Volleyball World League championship in July and filming the attack.

According to the charge sheet, four of the players subjected the woman, whose identity was not revealed, to an hourand-a-half ordeal which they filmed and photographed. These four, team captain Rolando Cepeda Abreu (27), Abrahan Alfonso Gavilan (21), Ricardo Calvo Manzano (19) and Osmany Uriarte Mestre (21) received five-year prison sentences for aggravated rape.

A fifth player, Luis Sosa Sierra (21), received a shorter sentence of three years and six months, while the court acquitted a sixth teammate, Dariel Albo Miranda (24).

The Pirkanmaa district court in southern Finland ruled the woman had met some of the players at a basement nightclub in the hotel where the Cuban team was staying during the tournament in Tampere on the night of July 2.

She later agreed to go upstairs to Uriarte Mestre's room and the two had sex, at first with her consent. But Uriarte Mestre then invited Calvo Manzano-followed by his other teammates-to the room without her consent, the court found.

According to the prosecutor, Uriarte Mestre, Calvo Manzano, Cepeda Abreu and Alfonso Gavilan "had together and in mutual understanding forced (the victim) to several acts of sexual intercourse by means of violence and by taking advantage of (her) fear and state of helplessness."

The charge sheet said the men pulled her by her hair and held her by her neck, among other things, to stop her from leaving the room, while she screamed for them to stop.

The prosecutor said the victim's ordeal lasted two and a half hours, but the court found the hotel's video monitoring system showed the events took place within an hour and a half.

The players had denied the charges,

saying the sex had been consensual. The court handed Sosa Sierra a shorter sentence than the others because he raped her in another hotel room, without the others present.

MISSED RIO OLYMPICS

The court said meanwhile it had acquitted Dariel Albo Miranda as "significant doubt" persisted over his role in the events.

The court found no grounds to keep Albo Miranda in custody after the trial and he was released at the beginning of September.

"He immediately left the country to return to Cuba... I've understood he is with his family now," Lappalainen told AFP.

He said Albo Miranda was considering the possibility of seeking damages from the Finnish state for the two-month deprivation of liberty.

The trial was held behind closed doors in Tampere to protect the victim. The court said its decision was based both on the victim's account and on evidence such as text messages the players had sent each other after the incident.

All of the players pleaded not guilty and claimed the victim was willing to have sex with them, but the court said their accounts of the events were partly contradictory and changed several times during the investigation.

In addition to the prison sentences, the court ordered the five players to pay the victim a total of 24,000 euros (\$26,800) in damages.

Alfonso Gavilan's lawyer told AFP his client would appeal the verdict, but it was not immediately known whether the four others would appeal.

The maximum jail sentence for aggravated rape in Finland is 10 years. The players have been held in custody in Finland since early July. As a result, they missed the Olympic Games in Rio.

The remainder of the Cuban national team finished last in their group in Rio, with five straight defeats. — AFP

BIDS EQUATE TO LOWEST EVER COST FOR SOLAR POWER GENERATOR

ABU DHABI: Abu Dhabi has received six bids to build a 350 megawatt solar plant in the emirate, one of which was cited by the Abu Dhabi Water & Electricity Authority (ADWEA) as equating to the lowest cost for solar power generation by a commercial project. The proposed Sweihan plant east of Abu Dhabi is part of efforts by the oil-rich capital of the United Arab Emirates to diversify its energy

base into renewable as it seeks to generate 7 percent of its power from green methods by 2020

Of the six Sweihan bids, the lowest equated to 2.42 US cents per kilowatt-hour (kWh), state-owned ADWEA said in a statement carried by official news agency WAM. "It represents one of the most competitive prices seen to date in the global solar photovoltaic indus-

try," the statement said. The bidding companies were not named.

Falling cost, improving technology

The cost of generating solar power has been falling as the cost of the technology improves, while Middle Eastern nations have sought to drive down the price they pay for solar projects to take advantage of the

region's year-round sunshine. Neighboring emirate Dubai said in May that the third phase of Dubai Electricity and Water Authority's (DEWA) Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al-Maktoum Solar Park had attracted a lowest bid of 2.99 cents/kWh.

The Sweihan plant would be ADWEA's first foray into renewable energy, though green energy company Masdar has launched some

renewables projects in the emirate. ADWEA currently has 11 gas-fired independent water and power projects. Commercial operations at the Sweihan plant are expected to begin in the first quarter of 2019, ADWEA's statement said. A source told Reuters last December that the chosen developer would own 40 percent of the project, with 60 percent held by ADWEA. —Reuters

QATAR GAINS AFTER FTSE INCLUSION, SAUDI NEAR TECH SUPPORT LEVEL

climbed yesterday as passive funds flowed into shares now included in FTSE's secondary emerging market index while other Gulf markets sagged. Doha's index rose 1.0 percent, recouping some of the percent losses from the previous session. Passive funds will flow into 22 shares from Tuesday, and the stocks will continue to be bid up for several days to come as managers meet their fund mandates.

Islamic lender Masraf Al Rayan, which slumped 5.1 percent on Monday, added 1.9 percent and telecommunication provider Ooredoo, which also dropped 5.1 percent the previous session, climbed 0.4 percent. Elsewhere, Saudi Arabia's index slipped 0.2 percent to 5,925 points but closed 56 points above its intra-day low. The index remains close to technical support established by the August low of 5,911 points.

Banking shares were hit hardest, with Samba Financial Group dropping 2.8 percent. Some petrochemical shares underperformed as Brent futures fell below \$46 a barrel; large-cap producer Saudi Kayan Petrochemical slipped 1.6 percent. But Saudi Telecom Co (STC) rose 1.8 percent to 56.00 riyals (\$14.93) after Bloomberg reported on Monday that the company was exploring options for its \$1.8 billion indirect stake in

DUBAI: Qatar's equity index Maxis, the second-largest cent and the largest listed real Malaysian wireless carrier. A Malaysian pension fund or large investors are among the potential buyers, the report said.

Positive notes

Riyadh-based NCB Capital said in a note that STC's losses from international operations stood at 250 million riyals (\$66.65 million) in first half of 2016 which reflects the company's long-term issue with its international investments. "On a positive note, Maxis is currently trading at a forward price to earnings higher than the global median. Therefore, we believe the current valuation is attractive for STC."

Analysts at NCB rate the stock a "buy" with a price target of 68.9 riyals. Almarai rose 1.8 percent after the largest dairy producer in the Gulf said the partial commercial operations of its new bakery facility in the the northern city Hail has started. The facility has four production lines with a total investment of 856 million riyals.

Dubai's index pulled back 0.9 percent, hit by profit taking in line with subdued global markets. GFH Financial Group lost 2.0 percent and Dubai Investments dropped 1.4 perent. In Abu Dhabi, the share index dropped 0.4 percent to an 11-week low closing level, with a little under half of the traded shares declining. Abu Dhabi National Energy retreated 3.9 per-

estate developer Aldar Properties lost 1.5 percent.

Cairo outperforms

Investors turned slightly more positive towards Egyptian shares, with Cairo's main index adding 0.9 percent. The government will start talks with China over a \$2 billion loan next week and plans to issue international bonds in October or November, the Deputy Finance Minister for Treasury said on Monday. This comes after an IMF official said last week that the Fund had held "very productive discussions" with authorities in China and Saudi Arabia about their contributing to that bilateral financing.

Some of the shares favored by foreign funds outperformed with Global Telecom Holding adding 2.4 percent and Commercial International Bank rising 1.2 percent. Over the last several months the government has been proactive about jolting the economy back to stronger growth and replenishing the dried up hard currency stock. Case in point, the Trade and Industry Minister Tarek Kabil said on Tuesday that exports would rise by 10 percent if and when authorities devalue the pound. In March the central bank devalued the currency, but its positive effects were short lived as capital inflow remained subpar. —Reuters

PEOPLE WASTE MONEY ON PREMIUM GASOLINE

DETROIT: There is no sense paying a premium for premium gasoline if your car is designed to run on regular, according to research by the automobile club AAA. Some drivers occasionally like to treat their cars to higheroctane fuel in the belief it boosts performance. But premium blends can cost around 50 cents a gallon more than regular.

AAA says it's just money out the tailpipe - lots of it. In a national survey on gasoline use, AAA said 16.5 million US drivers spent \$2.1 billion they didn't need to in the past year on premium gasoline. Many think premium means quality. But AAA researchers found that while it has more octane, it didn't increase horsepower or fuel economy, decrease emissions or clean engines any better than regular gas in cars that are designed by the manufacturer to run on 87-octane regular.

"Drivers see the 'premium' name at the pump and may assume the fuel is better for their vehicle," said John Nielsen, AAA's managing director of automotive engineering. However, if your owner's manual specifically says to run your car on 93 octane premium or 89 octane mid-grade gas, you should do it to make it perform optimally, according to the researchers. More luxury and performance brands are using turbocharging or supercharging to get better performance out of smaller engines, and those may require premium gas, Nielsen said.

AAA researchers joined with the Automobile Club of Southern California to test V8, V6 and fourcylinder engines, coming up with the same results each time, Nielsen said.

Seventy percent of U.S. drivers own vehicles that require regular gas, while 16 percent are required to use premium fuel. The rest, about 14 percent, must use at least mid-grade gas or have an alternative fuel such as electricity, AAA says.

People also waste money on gasoline in another key way, according to AAA. Earlier this year the association studied fuel quality at a number of gas stations to see if some were better than others. Researchers found that brands that meet the industry's "Top Tier" standards had better additives that prevented ash deposits on valves and cleaned engines better than non-Top Tier brands. And the Top Tier gasoline usually costs about the same as other brands, the association said.

Researchers found that ash deposits could cause cars to hesitate, run rough and make the engines run less efficiently, Nielsen said. Generally the major brands meet the Top Tier standards, including BP, Exxon, Mobil, Amoco and Shell. But lesser-known brands also are in there, such as Holiday, Costco and Kwik Star. — AP



FEDS PREVIEW RULES OF THE **ROAD FOR SELF-DRIVING CARS**

BRINGING SELF-DRIVING CARS TO THE HIGHWAY SAFELY

WASHINGTON: Obama administration officials are previewing long-awaited guidance that attempts to bring self-driving cars to the nation's roadways safely - without creating so many roadblocks that the technology can't make it to market quickly. Traditional automakers and tech companies have been testing self-driving prototypes on public roads for several years, with a human in the driver's seat just in case. The results suggest that what once seemed like a technology perpetually over the horizon appears to be fast approaching, especially with car companies announcing a string of investments and acquisitions in recent months.

Federal officials have been struggling with how to capitalize on the technology's promised safety benefits - the cars can react faster than people, but don't drink or get distracted - while making sure they are ready for widespread use. The new guidance represents their current thinking, which they hope will bring some order to what has been a chaotic rollout so far. Selfdriving cars have the potential to save thousands of lives lost on the nation's roads each year and to change the lives of the elderly and the disabled, President Barack Obama said in an op-ed published Monday by the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette. "Safer, more accessible driving. Less congested, less polluted roads. That's what

harnessing technology for good can look like," Obama wrote. But he added: "We have to get it right. Americans deserve to know they'll be safe today even as we develop and deploy the technologies of tomorrow." One self-driving technology expert said the overall tenor of the guidance signaled that the federal government truly has embraced autonomous driving. "In terms of just attitude, this is huge," said Bryant Walker Smith, a law professor at the University of South Carolina who closely tracks the technology. He also cautioned that many details remain unclear.

Transportation regulators

Under the proposal, the federal transportation regulators, rather than states, should be in charge of regulating self-driving cars since the vehicles are essentially controlled by software, not people, administration officials said. States have historically set the rules for licensing drivers, but when the driver becomes a computer "we intend to occupy the field here," Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx said. States, he said, should stick to registering the cars and dealing with questions of liability when they crash.

Automakers should also be allowed to selfcertify the safety of autonomous vehicles by following a 15-point checklist for safe design, development, testing and deployment, said officials who briefed reporters. Though companies are not required to follow the guidance - it is voluntary and does not carry the force of formal regulation - Foxx said he expects compliance. "It's in their vested interest to go through the rigors that we're laying out here" to gain the confidence of both regulators and the public, Foxx said.

In somewhat contradictory fashion, officials also said the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration is examining whether it should have "pre-market approval" authority, in which the government inspects and approves new technologies like autonomous vehicles. That would be a departure from the agency's historic self-certification system and might require action from Congress. Officials spoke to reporters ahead of a news conference scheduled for Tuesday at which they plan to provide greater detail of their guidance to automakers and states, as well as new powers and resources that the NHTSA may require.

NHTSA has been striving to make the guidelines a concise framework, rather than a lengthy set of detailed standards and regulations. The agency's administrator, Mark Rosekind, has said he wants the guidelines to be flexible to keep pace with industry innovation. — AP

WHY IT MATTERS: WALL STREET REGULATION

WASHINGTON: The financial crisis that struck in 2008 touched off the worst recession since the 1930s Great Depression, wiping out \$11 trillion in U.S. household wealth and leaving about 8 million Americans jobless. More than 5 million families lost their homes to foreclosure. Reckless trading and aggressive practices on Wall Street in the prior boom years were pinned with much of the blame.

In the aftermath, Congress enacted an overhaul of financial rules aimed at preventing another meltdown and multibillion-dollar taxpayer bailout of banks. The 2010 Dodd-Frank law gave regulators new oversight powers and tools to shut banks without resorting to bailouts. Risky lending was restricted and a new federal agency was charged with protecting consumers from deceptive marketing of financial products. Republicans and many in the business community complain that the restrictions have raised costs for banks, especially smaller ones, and other businesses, stifling economic growth. They want the overhaul law repealed.

Where they stand

Hillary Clinton says the Dodd-Frank law should be strengthened. She'd slap a new "risk fee" on the biggest banks and financial institutions, and give regulators more power to force high-risk banks to shrink or break apart. That doesn't go as far as Bernie Sanders' "Break them up" mantra during his Democratic primary campaign against her.

Donald Trump wants the financial overhaul law to be repealed, or at least mostly dismantled. He embraces the view held by Republicans and business interests that the regulations have increased costs and smothered growth. He calls the law a "disaster" and a "disgrace."

Why it matters

Eight years on, the economy's recovery from the havoc brought by the financial crisis has been halting and slow. And popular resentment still smolders over the multibillion-dollar bailout by US taxpayers of Wall Street mega-banks and financial firms in the crisis. It gave a big lift to Sanders' upstart campaign. It also created some

heartburn for Clinton because of her financial connections. She and husband Bill have collected tens of millions of dollars in speaking fees from Wall Street banks, insurance companies and other financial firms. Over her 15-year political career, she's received tens of millions in campaign donations from people in the finance, insurance and real estate industries.

Beyond their stake as taxpayers, American consumers have an interest in the financial regulations that came in after the meltdown. The Dodd-Frank law set up the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, which expanded regulators' oversight of mortgage firms, credit card issuers, payday lenders, student loan providers and others.

Debate rages over whether Wall Street banks still are "too big to fail" - with government bailouts inevitable. Critics of Wall Street say bigger banks can mean reduced competition and higher fees for consumers. Several of the banks did get bigger as they absorbed failing institutions during the crisis. On the other side, defenders say big banks such as Citigroup, Bank of America, JPMorgan Chase and Goldman Sachs are getting smaller and simpler on their own, mainly by selling off big-chunk assets and businesses. Generally, though, the shrinking that's occurred isn't enough to overcome the bulking-up during the crisis. Reaching further for a solution, liberal Democratic critics of Wall Street like Sanders and Sen Elizabeth Warren have pushed for Congress to restore the Depression-era firewall between the more staid commercial side of banking and its risk-taking investment side. Clinton has not. Bringing back the so-called Glass-Steagall law probably would lead to the breakup of major banks. In a surprise, the Republican Party advocated reviving that law in its platform. For a party that traditionally favors deregulation and handsoff governance, folding the provision into a sharply conservative platform brought double-takes among the political crowd. The move may have been designed to appeal to Sanders supporters who don't

FED UNLIKELY TO LIFT RATES

WASHINGTON: The Federal Reserve opens its sixth monetary policy meeting this year yesterday again facing the quandary that the US economy is not clearly ready for an interest rate hike. While some economists say the Fed, long anxious to pull away from its crisis-era ultralow rate policy, could surprise with an increase in the federal funds rate on Wednesday, most say it will stand pat.

With that benchmark, crucial to borrowing and deposit rates around the world, stuck at 0.25-0.50 percent, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC), which sets monetary policy, has repeatedly signaled intentions to increase it this year. But some weak economic data in recent weeks raises a question mark over the strength of the US economy. And persistent weakness in other major economies also continues to challenge the rationale for a rate increase.

Jim O'Sullivan, chief US economist at High Frequency Economics, said he thinks December is the month for an increase. "We expect Fed officials to couple an on-hold announcement this week with more pronounced 'tightening is imminent' guidance," he said in a client note. Just three weeks ago, comments made at the Fed's

annual central banking symposium in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, signaled that the FOMC could finally pull the rate trigger at the end of its September 20-21 meeting. Most notably, Fed Chair and FOMC head Janet Yellen said clearly that she thought the time had come. "In light of the continued solid performance of the labor market and our outlook for economic activity and inflation, I believe the case for an increase in the federal funds rate has strengthened in recent months," she said.

'Like waiting for Godot'

Others, including Fed Deputy Chair Stanley Fischer, reinforced that impression. But the data since then has not supported them. Job creation has been relatively good, and the housing market solid. But, extending the second-quarter's slump, industrial output and consumer spending have stayed weak. In addition, inflationwhich the Fed has sought with its hefty stimulus policy to increase-remains feeble, not appearing to react to a world awash in easy money.

The last FOMC official to speak ahead of the meeting, Fed Governor Lael Brainard, held firm with her view that the global economy matters to the Fed, and that it need not rush into a rate hike. "To the extent that the effect on inflation of further gradual tightening in labor market conditions is likely to be moderate and gradual, the case to tighten policy preemptively is less compelling," she said on September 12.

An increase could happen Wednesday, but it would shock markets. Based on CME fed fund futures trading, the markets give a rate increase Wednesday a 12 percent chance. "Waiting for the Fed to hike rates is like waiting for Godot," said Steven Ricchiuto of Mizuho Securities. "No matter how often the makers of domestic monetary policy signal that they are primed to hike rates, the data fails to give them the opportunity, and the September FOMC meeting is likely to be the next in a long string of false positives."

While the US is much stronger than the other major economies, the Fed is caught in a similar quandary to the European Central Bank and the Bank of Japan. The economic data is neither strong enough nor consistent enough to tighten the current policy. Last week the ECB held rates steady as it seeks proof that its massive stimulus program, with negative interest rates, is working. — AFP

LUFTHANSA SIGNS A JOINT VENTURE WITH AIR CHINA

FRANKFURT: German airline Lufthansa and Air China said yesterday they had signed a deal to jointly operate all the groups' connections between Europe and China. "The Chinese aviation market is one of the most important growth markets worldwide. We want to profit from this growth together," Lufthansa chief executive Carsten Spohr said in a statement.

The Chinese flag carrier and Lufthansa, Europe's largest airline, have had a joint venture in their sights since signing a memorandum of understanding in 2014. The move is "another major step of Air China's globalization strategy," chairman Cai Jianjiang said. Added to Lufthansa's other co-operations, including with Japan's ANA and Singapore Airlines in

Asia, and United Airlines and Air Canada in north America, the joint venture means around half of the German giant's longhaul flights are now covered by such agreements. The two groups plan to coordinate their schedules, offer common fares and improve their offers to corporate clients and frequent flyers under the arrangement. As well as Lufthansa itself, the deal covers subsidiaries Austrian Airlines and Swiss International Airlines. Passengers travelling into Europe from China will be able to connect through the Lufthansa group's hubs in Frankfurt, Zurich and Vienna, while the two firms promised "additional routes in China" with Air China and via code-sharing for those travelling in the other direction. — AFP

WAL-MART COMPLETES \$3BN PLUS PURCHASE OF JET.COM

has completed its deal to buy fastgrowing Jet.com for \$3 billion in cash plus \$300 million in stock, an acquisition aimed at helping the world's largest retailer attract younger and more affluent customers to drive online sales.

The hefty price tag shows how heavily Wal-Mart is willing to invest as it tries to boost online sales that totaled \$13.7 billion last year - still just a fraction of the company's annual revenue. While Wal-Mart and Jet.com will operate as separate

NEW YORK: Wal-Mart said Monday it brands, Wal-Mart has said it will incorporate some of Jet.com's "smart technology" that lowers prices in real times by looking for ways to cut costs.

As part of the deal, which was announced in early August, Jet.com co-founder and CEO Marc Lore will oversee both that site and Walmart.com, and will report to Wal-Mart CEO Doug McMillon. Lore will serve as executive vice president at Wal-Mart and president and CEO of Wal-Mart's e-commerce business in the US.

Lore brings to the role a rich e-

commerce resume as founder of Quidsi, the parent Diapers.com, which was bought by Amazon for \$500 million in 2010. As part of the stock portion of the deal, Lore received 3.55 million shares of restricted Wal-Mart common stock to be paid over five years. The exact value depends on Wal-Mart's share price. But based on Monday's closing price of \$72.09, the shares would have a current worth of nearly \$256 million.

Jet's pricing technology is built on an algorithm that determines which sellers are the most efficient in value

and shipping and adjusts prices based on what items are in the checkout cart as well as how far the desired products are from the shoppers' home. So shoppers are encouraged to add more to build a more efficient cart and buy items labeled "smart cart" for more savings.

Analysts say that the deal still won't enable Wal-Mart to catch up to online leader Amazon.com in sales, but will help narrow the gap and should widen the distance between Wal-Mart and other online rivals. For Jet.com, which had been pouring money into splashy TV ads and other marketing, being owned by Wal-Mart should accelerate its path to profitability.

In a Wal-Mart blog post on Monday, McMillon wrote, "Wal-Mart and Jet.com obsess about saving customers time and money. By joining forces, we'll be better at doing both, creating seamless shopping from app to site to store." On McMillon's Instagram account was an image of Jet's purple T-shirt with a note saying, "I've been waiting a month to put on this shirt." — AP

WASHINGTON: The CEO of Wells Fargo apologized before harshly critical senators yesterday for betraying customers' trust in a scandal over allegations that employees opened millions of unauthorized accounts and moved money into them. Chief Executive John Stumpf showed contrition in testimony to the Senate Banking Committee, saying he is "deeply sorry" that the bank failed to meet its responsibility to customers and didn't act sooner to stem what he called "this unacceptable activity." He promised that the bank will contact every affected customer.

Sen Richard Shelby, R-Ala, the panel's chairman, said Wells Fargo had a corporate culture "that drove company 'team members' to fraudulently open millions of accounts using their customers' funds and personal information without their permission." "If there were ever a textbook case where consumers needed protecting, this was it," Shelby said. As part of the sharp questioning, Stumpf was pressed on whether Wells Fargo employees committed fraud, and Sen Bob Corker of ennessee said it would be "malpractice the bank doesn't institute compensation clawbacks. The bank has in place executive compensation clawback provisions that the board could implement. Stumpf said during the hearing that the company's board "has the tools to hold senior leadership accountable," including himself and Carrie Tolstedt, the former head of the retail banking business. Tolstedt announced in July her retirement from the bank this year. Tolstedt is expected to leave with as much as \$125 million in salary, stock options and other compensation.

Aggressive sale goals

Wells Fargo has long been known for its aggressive sales goals, but the details and the \$185 million fine that regulators imposed last week have singed the consumer banking giant's reputation as a well-run, tightly managed company removed from the reckless conduct on Wall Street that stoked the financial crisis. In announcing the fine, regulators said Wells Fargo sales employees opened more than 2 million bank and credit card accounts that may not have been authorized by customers. Money in customers' accounts was said to have been moved to these new accounts without their permission. Debit cards were issued and activated, as well as PINs created, without telling customers. In some cases, bank employees even created fake email addresses to sign up customers for online banking services, the regulators said.

The bank sales staff had a goal of getting each customer to have eight different accounts with the bank - up from the prevailing average of six. Under the settlement, Wells Fargo neither admitted nor denied the allegations. It later said it plans to eliminate he sales targets by Jan 1. Some 5,300 Wells: Fargo employees have been fired. Stumpf offered some detail at the hearing about who was fired, saying "bankers, bank managers, managers of managers, and even an area president." They ranged in pay from about \$35,000 to \$65,000. The panel also plans to question regulators from the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, the Treasury Department's Office of the Controller of the Currency and the Los Angeles City Attorney's Office. Senators are examining their role in the debacle and why the sales practices went on for years before the regulators cracked down. —AP

ALABAMA GOV PRAISES PIPELINE COMPANY'S RESPONSE TO LEAK

GAS PRICES RISE DRASTICALLY IN SEVERAL STATES

ATLANTA: Alabama Gov Robert Bentley said gas prices in parts of the state rose 20 cents over the weekend after a pipeline leak, but he didn't consider that price gouging. "It changes overnight sometimes that much," he said. Bentley toured Colonial Pipeline's emergency response center, in a luxurv resort hotel about 12 miles from the pipeline breach, and spent much of a news conference Monday praising the company's response.

A disaster drill was held coincidentally last year near the scene of the spill, he said, and that helped the company plan and execute a response that included about 700 people so far. Colonial said it was working "around the clock" to repair the break and supplies have been delivered or are on their way to locations in Alabama, Georgia, Tennessee, South Carolina, and North Carolina. Colonial said Monday evening in a statement that it expects the temporary pipeline to be running by the end of the week but gave no specific day.

In Georgia, AAA reported that the price of regular gas jumped more than 5 cents from Sunday's average of \$2.26 to just more than \$2.31. The average price a week ago was about \$2.10. "Oh, yeah, I've noticed that the prices have just gone up - I mean, through the roof!" Tom Wargo said at a gas station northeast of Atlanta. Wargo runs a nonprofit organization that supplies pet food to people in need and spends much of his time on the road. He just returned from a road trip to Louisiana, where he helped people after the floods there, he said. "I tried getting gas yesterday and a lot of the stations had no gas at all, except diesel," Wargo said Monday.

was \$2.16 - up from \$2.05 last week. In South Carolina, a gallon was selling for an average of \$2.04. That's an increase of 13 cents from last week. In the Chattanooga, Tennessee, area, the price of regular gas jumped 6 cents in one day, AAA reported. "We certainly expect the gas prices to increase, certainly while this line is under repair and not at full capacity," AAA spokesman Garrett Townsend said Monday.

Georgia Gov Nathan Deal issued an executive order Monday aimed at preventing price gouging. "There have been recent reports that wholesale and retail gas prices have substantially increased in some markets," he said. The shortage is blamed on a pipeline rupture and leak of at least 252,000 gallons (954,000 liters) of gas in Alabama. The pipeline company has two main lines and said Monday that it is shipping "significant volumes" on the second of the two lines to limit the effect of the interruption on the other line. Still, some motorists discovered bone-dry pumps.

Lindsey Paluka, 28, stopped at a Shell gas station in the East Atlanta neighborhood only to find a gas pump handle covered by a black garbage bag. "I'm definitely on empty, so I'm going to have to figure something out," she said. Alpharetta, Georgia-based Colonial has acknowledged that between 252,000 gallons (954,000 liters) and 336,000 gallons (1,272,000 liters) of gasoline leaked from a pipeline near Helena, Alabama, since the spill was first detected Sept. 9. It's unclear when the spill actually began.

According to a preliminary report, it wasn't possible to immediately pinpoint the leak, partly



because highly flammable benzene and gasoline vapors hung in the air and prevented firefighters, company officials and anyone else from being near the site for more than three days. State workers discovered the leak when they noticed a strong gasoline odor and sheen on a man-made retention pond, along with dead vegetation nearby, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration said in the report The report does not identify the

cause of the leak. The agency, part of the US Department of Transportation, is investigating the leak in a section of the pipeline constructed in 1963, it said. Governors across the South issued executive orders last week to suspend limitations on trucking hours, allowing drivers to stay on the road longer to bring fuel to gas stations. —AP

US JUDGE CLAIMS **BITCOIN IS MONEY**

NEW YORK: Bitcoin qualifies as money, a federal judge ruled on Monday, in a decision linked to a criminal case over hacking attacks against JPMorgan Chase & Co and other companies. US District Judge Alison Nathan in Manhattan rejected a bid by Anthony Murgio to dismiss two charges related to his alleged operation of Coin.mx, which prosecutors have called an unlicensed bitcoin exchange.

Murgio had argued that bitcoin did not qualify as "funds" under the federal law prohibiting the operation of unlicensed money transmitting businesses. But the judge, like her colleague Jed Rakoff in an unrelated 2014 case, said the virtual currency met that definition. "Bitcoins are funds within the plain meaning of that term," Nathan wrote. "Bitcoins can be accepted as a payment for goods and services or bought directly from an exchange with a bank account. They therefore function as pecuniary resources and are used as a medium of exchange and a means of payment."

The decision did not address six other criminal counts that Murgio faces, Nathan wrote. Brian Klein, a lawyer for Murgio, said he disagreed with the decision. "Anthony Murgio maintains his innocence and looks forward to clearing his name at his upcoming trial," he added. Prosecutors last year charged Murgio over the operation of Coin.mx, and in April charged his father Michael with participating in bribery aimed at supporting it.

Authorities have said Coin.mx was owned by Gery Shalon, an Israeli man who, along with two others, was charged with running a sprawling computer hacking and fraud scheme targeting a dozen companies, including JPMorgan, and exposing personal data of more than 100 million people. That alleged scheme generated hundreds of millions of dollars of profit through pumping up stock prices, online casinos, money laundering and other illegal activity, prosecutors have said. Shalon has pleaded not guilty, and is being held at the Metropolitan Correctional Center in Manhattan. He hired new lawyers last month and is seeking permission to replace lawyers who joined the case in June, a Monday court filing showed. —Reuters

SPAIN'S BANCO POPULAR PLANS TO AXE 3K JOBS

MADRID: Spain's struggling Banco Popular said yesterday it plans to axe up to 3,000 jobs, about a fifth of its workforce, in the latest round of cost cutting by a Spanish lender. The bank plans to close around 300 of its 2,000 branches in Spain as part of a restructuring, it said in a statement. "This restructuring process will affect between 2,900 and 3,000 people," the statement said.

The bank said it would negotiate the job cuts with unions. Banco Popular, Spain's seventh largest bank by market capitalization, announced a costcutting plan in July, a month after raising 2.5 billion euros (\$2.8 billion) in a share issue to clean up its balance sheet. Like other Spanish lenders, it is making a major push to sell off real estate assets, including repossessed homes, which are clogging up its balance sheet and eating into earnings.

Banco Popular in July reported a second quarter net profit of just 122,000 euros and announced provisions on bad loans of 4.7 billion euros. Spanish banks, which slimmed down after a decade-long property boom went bust in 2008, are once again closing branches and slashing jobs as their profitability is hit by stiff competition. —AFP

DETROIT: General Motors reached a tentative agreement with negotiators representing Canadian auto workers late Monday, narrowly averting a midnight strike deadline. The settlement followed a lengthy bargaining session in which several issues were finally resolved, said Jerry Dias, the president of Unifor, the union representing more than 3,900 GM workers in Ontario. GM has promised new investment at the company's assembly plant in Oshawa and at an engine and transmission plant in St Catherine-both facilities in Ontario-as part of the deal.

Unifor is Canada's largest private sector union, representing more than 310,000 workers, including 23,050 at the Detroit Three. It was formed

mitment by GM to bring a new product into the Oshawa assembly plant outside Toronto.

'Member ratification'

"Oshawa will get a new platform that will be able to used for a truck or a car," said Dias, who said he would provide more details when he presented the complete contract to Unifor members later in the week. "GM has agreed to hundreds of millions of dollars in Oshawa," Dias said. The tentative contract also includes a pay increase and signing bonus, Dias said. The agreement will enable significant new investment in products and technology at GM's Oshawa, St Catharines and Woodstock facilities, the labor leader said.

"The agreement is subject to member ratification. We will be working with (the) government on potential support, and will provide further details on the investment at the appropriate time, while respecting Unifor's ratification process." The union did make one major concession. Going forward, new employees will be eligible for a defined contribution-style pension plan rather than a more lucrative defined-benefit-style pension plan that union members with seniority are now eligible. Capping pension costs was one of GM's major objectives.

In return, GM agreed to make 700 temporary workers full-time employees, which Dias described as a major win for the union because it will bolster the union's organizing efforts at the assembly plants that Honda and Toyota now operate in Ontario. "Those temporary employees at Honda and Toyota now know the way to get full-time employment is through collective bargaining," Dias said. The fallout from a strike in Canada would have spread quickly to GM assembly plant in the US and Mexico, Unifor, said as the deadline approached. Dias has said the negotiations with General Motors, Ford Motor Co. and Fiat Chrysler Automobile are critical to the future of the auto industry in Canada, where production has steadily declined over the past 10 years new investment has shifted to Mexico where labor costs are cheaper. Dias said GM acknowledged the value of its Canadian operations, which have developed a reputation for building high quality products. —AFP

Dollar subdued as Fed, BOJ meet begins

ground against the yen yesterday, as investors awaited the outcomes of Federal Reserve and Bank of Japan meetings that will both conclude tomorrow. Nagging doubts about the firepower left available to top central banks and a slip in oil prices made for another subdued start in Europe as the STOXX 600 dipped in and out of the red after seven falls in the last 10 days. Industrial firms Crude prices slipped after major producer Venezuela, itself in a deep economic crisis,

LONDON: Shares hit pause and the dollar lost said oil markets were effectively 10 percent oversupplied.

The yen was creeping higher in the currency markets, meanwhile amid speculation the Bank of Japan may do little more than tinker with its stimulus programme and that the Federal Reserve was likely to stay guarded about its rate hike plans. From Commerzbank in Frankfurt, Esther Reichelt said she expected a quiet day, though thin trading volumes climbed while oil and gas was the weak spot. could lead to some exaggerated moves not driven by fundamental factors. "Everybody is just waiting for the BOJ and the Fed - why do

anything today?" she said. "Everyone has already positioned for these events and there is no new information that could give them a reason to reposition."

The yen was changing hands at 101.645 yen. It has risen almost 20 percent over the past 12 months despite the BOJ's best efforts to weaken it. The euro was also up at\$1.1190, though the pound dipped to \$1.3008. The pre-BOJ and Fed caution kept Europe's bond market moves small too, although longerdated euro zone government yields edged lower with the BOJ expected to try to lever

investors away from its longer-maturity bonds. The yield on 30-year German Bunds fell 5 basis points to 0.60 percent, and there were similar moves on Dutch, Finnish, French and Spanish 30-year government bonds.

Other euro zone bond yields also fell, if not quite so sharply. Germany's 10year Bund, the region's benchmark bond, dropped 1.8 bps, turning back into negative territory while Portugal saw a second day of outperformance. European tension over the UK's vote to leave the EU and a flood of immigration has also continued to simmer. British Prime Minister Theresa May met US business chiefs from firms including Goldman Sachs, IBM and Amazon yesterday in New York to try and reassure investors, while German leader Angela Merkel appeared rueful over the refugee crisis. "If I could, I would turn back time by many, many years," Merkel said, sounding particularly somber.

Emerging drama

Despite the holding pattern in major markets, plenty of action loomed in emerging markets. Hungary's central bank was expected to stick to its unconventional easing policy following a surprise S&P upgrade to investment grade on Friday that has bolstered its high flying stock and bond markets and the forint.

Nigeria, which in contrast was downgraded on Friday, also has a central bank meeting. A Reuters poll shows it is expected to stay on hold before hiking interest rates later in the year. Its finance minister, though, made a strident call for a cut yesterday. In Asia overnight, MSCI's broadest index of Asia-Pacific shares outside Japan slipped 0.1 percent.

Australian shares finished slightly higher. The Australian Securities Exchange opened without incident on Tuesday after technical faults caused extensive disruptions yesterday. Japan's Nikkei erased its early gains to end 0.2 percent lower as trading resumed after a public holiday yesterday. Tokyo markets will also be closed on Thursday, with the BOJ meeting sandwiched in between. Oil slipped back to \$45.79 per barrel having briefly rallied yesterday on Venezuela's bid to talk up a potential OPEC output freeze, though that soon fizzled on indications that US crude stockpiles had risen again last week.

Gold though added 0.2 percent to \$1,315.90 an ounce, on expectations that the Fed will stand pat on rates when it ends its two-day meeting tomorrow. EMini futures for the S&P 500 also edged up 0.2 percent, after major US indexes ended yesterday's choppy session nearly flat. Global markets have been blowing hot and cold in recent weeks over the Fed's intentions, which remain far from clear after both hawkish and dovish comments from several Fed officials. "It's a lot of uncertainty, leading into the Fed," said Jennifer Vail, head of fixed income research at US Bank Wealth Management in Portland, Oregon. —Reuters

BRITISH DRUGS COMPANY GLAXO APPOINTS CEO

LONDON: GlaxoSmithKline yesterday appointed Emma Walmsley, its head of consumer healthcare, to lead the British drugs giant and develop new treatments in a fast-consolidating sector. Walmsley, 47, succeeds outgoing chief executive Andrew Witty, who is retiring early next year after almost a decade at the helm. Walmsley, who joined GSK from French cosmetics giant L'Oreal six years ago and has a background in marketing, will take up her new post at the end of March.

She will join six other women who currently head one of the 100 companies listed on London's benchmark FTSE index but will oversee the largest of the seven, which include EasyJet, led by Carolyn McCall. The global pharmaceutical sector has undergone major consolidation in recent years as companies battle competition for generic versions of their drugs.

In the past month, US giant Pfizer announced a deal to purchase biotech firm Medivation, which specialises in cancer treatments, for \$14 billion (12.5 billion euros). Google and French pharmaceutical giant Sanofi have meanwhile agreed a joint venture focused on diabetes care. For its part, GSK agreed in 2014 to sell its oncology business to Novartis for \$16 billion, while buying the Swiss group's vaccines division in return. The pair also formed a joint venture for consumer health products, headed by Walmsley. "Emma is an outstanding leader with highly valuable experience of building and running major global businesses and a strong track record of delivering growth and driving performance in healthcare," GSK chairman Philip Hampton said in a statement. "Under Andrew's leadership, GSK has successfully developed into a company with market-leading positions in pharmaceuticals, vaccines and consumer healthcare. These provide excellent platforms for sustainable, long-term growth," he added. Alongside the Novartis deal, the latter part of Witty's tenure was clouded by Chinese authorities fining GSK the equivalent of almost half a billion dollars in 2014 over alleged bribery. The firm's former head of China operations, Mark Reilly, and four other ex-officials were handed suspended prison sentences over the incident.

'R&D the beating heart' Looking ahead, Walmsley said in the statement that GSK has "the potential to create meaningful benefits for patients, consumers and our shareholders" thanks to a rise in "medical innovation and trusted healthcare products". In an interview posted on the firm's website, the married, motherof-four added that research and developement of new products would remain GSK's priority under her stewardship.

"R&D is absolutely the beating heart of our company and our success is and will continue to be defined most fundamentally by the strength of our pipeline," she said.

The Oxford University graduate pointed also to challenges that lay ahead for her company and the sector as a whole. "Pricing is a key area of focus, government and household budgets are under pressure, the regulatory environment is extremely tough and unpredictable and of course society wants big business and big pharma to continue to close the trust deficit that has been widening," she said.

GSK's shares were down 0.6 percent at £16.36 in late morning deals following the announcement, underperforming the wider FTSE 100, which gained half a percent. "The GSK business, including pharma, is in stronger shape than the market realizes and this 'don't upset the apple cart' appointment is consistent with this view," brokers Liberum said in a note to clients. GSK said details of Walmsley's salary would be disclosed next year. The company employs around 100,000 people worldwide, of which one-tenth work in R&D. — AFP

ASIAN TRADERS TREAD LIGHTLY AHEAD OF C BANK DECISIONS

HONG KONG: Asian stocks markets drifted yesterday and the dollar was virtually unmoved with investors biding their time as crucial central bank gatherings in the United States and Japan kick off. The Fed heads into one of its most keenly awaited policy meetings after weeks of speculation that has fanned volatility across global trading floors, with investors split on whether it will lift interest rates.

At the same time opinion is divided on what the Bank of Japan's intentions are, with expectations for fresh stimulus tempered by a lack of concrete promises from Tokyo, despite weak growth and almost non-existent inflation. The uncertainty leading up to the meeting is keeping traders at bay, Chris Weston, chief market analyst in Melbourne at IG Ltd, said. "No one is prepared to take on too much risk ahead of the Bank of Japan and the Fed Open Market Committee meetings," he told Bloomberg News. Tokyo's Nikkei index swung to and fro through the day before ending 0.2 percent lower. Hong Kong shed 0.1 percent by the close and Shanghai lost 0.1 percent following healthy gains Monday. Sydney added 0.2 percent and Seoul was 0.5 percent higher, while Singapore shed 0.2 percent. In early European trade London fell 0.2 percent, Frankfurt was flat and Paris fell 0.3 percent. Currency markets were also subdued ahead of the bank announcements, which are due Wednesday. The dollar edged down to 101.70 yen from 101.88 yen in New York while the euro was at \$1.1185 from \$1.1175. Sterling bought \$1.3055 compared with \$1.3028.

"It's not unusual for traders to adopt a more cautious approach ahead of these events, particularly when we have two on the same day, both of which have the potential to create huge amounts of volatility in the markets," said OANDA senior market analyst Craig Frlam in a note.

Oil prices turned lower again, digging into Monday's gains as investors grow tetchy about the likelihood of a deal next week between OPEC and Russia aimed at addressing a global supply glut and overproduction. West Texas Intermediate eased 19 cents to \$43.11 and Brent dipped 16 cents to \$45.79. "A big part of the rally was the hope that

GOPRO HOPING TO INCREASE PROFITS WITH KARMA DRONE

Company battered by competition from all sides

SOUAW VALLEY: GoPro took to the sky vesterday with a much-awaited drone called Karma in the hope of lifting profits which have been battered by competition from all sides. The launch of the Karma drone, tailored for its first-personaction mini-cameras, and of improved Hero5 cameras comes on the cusp of the important year-end holiday shopping season which last year was a huge disappointment.

In the fourth guarter of 2015, GoPro lost about \$34.5 million, as revenue sank some 31 percent from the same period in 2014, to \$436.6 million. The earnings report fell well short of financial analysts' expectations, sparked a series of downgrades and sent GoPro's shares plunging as competition from smartphone makers turned out to be more threatening than forecast. This means the Karma launch, which comes alongside new Hero5 cameras and a cloud-based service for storing, editing and sharing video, is instrumental for a revival of the company's fortunes, analysts said.

"GoPro's Karma has potential to gain decent traction," Colin Snow, founder of Skylogic Research, told Bloomberg News, "if it's priced under \$1,000 and has all the capabilities of existing drones in that price category." Karma drones will be priced at \$799 when they become available starting on October 23. The drones boast simple joystick and touch-screen controls, and fold easily into a padded backpack that is provided. An image-stabilizing grip in the drone is designed to hold Hero cameras, which are not included in the backpack.

"We transformed GoPro into an end-to-end storytelling solution," company chief Nick Woodman said after making a rock-star entrance at a media event in a tent at the Squaw Valley ski area where the 1960 Winter Olympic Games were held.

RIDE-HAILING STARTUP 'GRAB' RAISES \$750M INVESTMENTS

SINGAPORE: Ride-hailing startup Grab said yesterday it has raised \$750 million from investors to expand in burgeoning Southeast Asian markets including Indonesia, as it aims to build its lead over US-based rival Uber in the region. The new investments led by Japan's SoftBank Group raised the Singapore-based firm's total capital to more than \$1.0 billion, it said in a statement.

Competition between Uber and local startups has grown fierce in Southeast Asia, home to more than 600 million people and a rising middle class. Grab is considered the leading ride-hailing platform in the region, operating in nearly twice as many cities as Uber, with the startup claiming up to 1.5 million bookings a day. Singapore state investment agency Temasek Holdings was an early investor in the firm.

Grab said participants in the recent round of fundraising included both new and existing investors which it did not name, but reports last month said China's

Didi Chuxing was among those planning to back the firm. The two companies are already partners in an alliance that also includes India's Ola and US-based Lyft Inc, allowing users to book rides while travelling to a country covered by any of the four apps.

Grab chief executive and co-founder Anthony Tan said the latest investment was "the largest in the history of Southeast Asia consumer technology". "We are particularly excited about the growth opportunity in Indonesia, where we see an almost US\$15 billion market for ride-hailing services alone," he said. The move follows Uber's decision to sell its business in China to Didi Chuxing last month, ending a ferocious battle for market share that cost both firms billions. Grab operates in Singapore, Indonesia, the Philippines, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam. Its core product platform includes private cars, motorbikes and taxi-hailing services which are rapidly gaining popularity in the region. — AFP

EU TAX ON APPLE IS NOT ANTI-US BIAS: VESTAGER

WASHINGTON: Europe's powerful Competition Commissioner Margrethe Vestager said Monday that the EU order for Apple to pay \$15 billion in taxes did not represent any bias against US companies. Speaking hours after the European Union launched an in-depth probe into alleged sweetheart tax deals between French gas group Engie and Luxembourg, Vestager said the new case was evidence that the EU was going after all tax evaders. "If you look at our practice, then you cannot find a US bias. You cannot find the statistics to back up any kind of bias," she said in Washington.

The European Commission, the EU executive arm, last month ordered Apple to reimburse a record 13 billion euros (\$15 billion) in unpaid taxes in Ireland. That came after US companies, including Starbucks, Amazon and Google parent Alphabet, have come under probes over the low profits tax they pay in Europe due to alleged sweetheart tax deals with certain governments. When the Apple ruling was announced late last month, US Treasury Secretary Jacob Lew criti-

cized it as unfairly targeting US companies. Vestager, speaking at a news conference ahead of a meeting with Lew, said that of some

150 such tax rulings made by the European Commission since 2000, only two percent involved US companies. She also said the tax hit on Apple was not a reprisal against US regulators' imposition of multibillion-dollar fines on European banks for violating US sanctions on other countries and for their involvement in the massive US subprime mortgage bond crisis.

Last week the US Justice Department proposed a record \$14 billion fine against Deutsche Bank for its selling of high-risk mortgage bonds before the 2008 financial crisis. "I am absolutely certain that the decision on Deutsche Bank is built on facts of the case and American legislation," Vestager said. Lew's office, in a statement late Monday after his meeting with Vestager, said that during their talks he "reiterated his concerns that the European Commission is retroactively applying a sweeping new Sstate aid theory that is contrary to well-established legal principles, calls into question the tax rules of individual countries and threatens to undermine the overall business climate in Europe." — AFP

BAYER UPS FORECASTS AFTER MONSANTO TAKEOVER DEAL

FRANKFURT: German chemicals giant Bayer said yesterday it had increased its earnings and profits forecasts after signing a deal to take over US seeds and pesticides maker Monsanto. "We are optimistic for the medium-term development of Bayer and have set ourselves correspondingly ambitious targets," chief executive Werner Baumann said in a statement.

In the crop science division that will integrate Monsanto, Bayer said it would grow sales faster than the market and increase its profit margin to "more than 30 percent" after 2020, three years after the merger is slated to be finalized. Between them, Monsanto and Bayer's crops division brought in 23.1 billion euros (\$25.8 billion) in sales in 2015.

Bayer justified the predictions with a "broad product palette and research and development pipeline" for the two companies, adding that the merged firms would bring new products to market faster. The 58.8-billion-euro deal is the largest takeover in history for a German firm and would create a giant in the agribusiness sector. But the tie-up still has to be voted through by Monsanto shareholders and pass regulators' scrutiny in both Europe and the US.

Environmental groups on both sides of the Atlantic have promised fierce opposition to the deal. Baumann said the pharmaceuticals division, one of two other major business areas, looked forward to "particularly high growth in sales and margins". The prescription medicines unit would target annual sales growth of 6.0 percent on average until the end of 2018, the firm said, and boost margins to "between 32 and 34 percent" compared with 2015's 30 percent.

Bayer pointed to a stable of five new medications-now forecast to bring in 10 billion euros in annual sales, up from 7.5 billion-and a "highly promising" pipeline in the division to explain its optimism. "By the end of 2023 we are planning to launch at least 20 new products in pharmaceuticals," Baumann said. Meanwhile, the consumer health unit aims to increase sales and margins by focusing on its globally-recognized brands, such as aspirin, and key markets, including the US, Russia, China and Brazil. Bayer added that the group would "exhaust the potential for licensing previously prescription-only medications for selfmedication" as well as developing new digital health offerings. —AFP

The Cisco 2016 Annual Security Report revealed that only 45 percent of organizations worldwide are confident in their security posture as today's attackers launch more sophisticated, bold and resilient campaigns. According to Cisco's MCR 2016, so far in 2016, ransomware has become the most profitable malware type in history with experts seeing this trend continuing with even more destructive ransomware that can spread by itself and hold entire networks, and therefore companies, hostage. Hackers increasingly tap into legitimate resources to launch effective campaigns for profit-gain.

Additionally, direct attacks by cybercriminals, leveraging ransomware alone, put \$34 million a year per campaign into their hands.

"Cloud, mobility, Internet of Things (IoT) and social media technologies, combined with digital business practices, have helped countless organizations transform how they operate but they have also increased the attack surface. Old methods of cybersecurity that focus on perimeter defense are no longer enough to keep an organization safe. Attackers are going undetected and expanding their time to operate.

To close the attackers' windows of opportunity, organizations will require more visibility into their networks and must improve activities, such as patching and retiring ageing infrastructure lacking in advanced security capabilities," said Scott Manson, Cyber Security Leader for Middle East and Turkey, Cisco.

Primary challenges

Visibility across the network and endpoints remains a primary challenge. On average, organizations take up to 200 days to identify new threats. Cisco's median time to detection (TTD) continues to outpace the industry, hitting a new low of approximately 13 hours to detect previously unknown

compromises. Faster time to detection of threats is critical to constrain attackers' operational space and minimize damage from intrusions.

Security is rapidly becoming an integral part of any sort of deployment, and this awareness is coming in earlier in the process, though often, not early enough. In order to enable organizations to tackle security challenges, they are facing a fundamental problem - the skills gap. According to Cisco 2016 Annual Security Report 2016, there is currently a deficit of 1 million security practitioners, increasing to 1.5 million by 2019. Globally, 26% of organizations are facing staffing shortages, and 35% are facing expertise shortages with security jobs growing at 12 times the rate of the overall job market, and 3 times the rate of general IT.

"Today, more than ever before, increased collaboration, communication and coordination both within organizations and across the security industry - are required to effectively combat the cyber threats. Across the board, organizations in the UAE will need to invest in the people, processes and technologies that will enable themselves to become more resilient in the face of new attacks and compete in the new digital age," concluded Scott.

INDONESIA REJECTS US RESEARCH ESTIMATE OF 100,000 'HAZE' DEATHS

JAKARTA: Harvard and Columbia university research showing smoke from land fires in Southeast Asia led to more than 100,000 premature deaths last year "makes no sense at all," an official at Indonesia's Health Ministry said yesterday. Indonesian government records show only 24 deaths related to forest fires in 2015, but the disaster was estimated to

have left more than half a million from last year's fires killed 91,600 people Indonesians suffering from respiratory ailments.

Indonesia is under global pressure to put an end to slash-and-burn land clearances for palm and pulp plantations which send clouds of toxic smoke over the region each year. The university research estimates pollution exposure

in Indonesia, 6,500 in Malaysia and 2,200 in Singapore in 2015 and 2016, significantly higher than government records. "Given the severe haze in Equatorial Asia in 2015, the 100,000 premature deaths in that region are not so surprising," said Loretta Mickley, a senior researcher at Harvard focusing on atmospheric pollution, who contributed to the research.

Health Ministry director general of disease prevention and control Mohamad Subuh told Reuters the research data was wrong. "Data on deaths is clear. We have surveillance," Subuh said, adding that the assumptions of mortality based on mathematical calculations were "irresponsible". Every year, Indonesia faces criticism

from its neighbors Singapore and Malaysia over the smog, euphemistically known as "haze", and its failure to stop the fires from being lit. Last year's fires were among the worst in the region's history, with billions of dollars worth of environmental damage, weeks of flight and school disruptions and thousands suffering from respiratory disease. —Reuters

time tackle the growing scourge of superbacteria, which are resistant to antibiotics and are making illnesses from tuberculosis to sexually transmitted diseases increasingly difficult to treat. The meeting will bring together heads of government and senior health officials on the margins of the United Nations General Assembly-a forum for global crises where such health issues rarely figure on the agenda. Under a draft document, the governments will look to commit themselves to bolster controls over antibiotics, to step up awareness over the problem and to encourage research in alternative treatments.

The World Health Organization hopes that the meeting will attract and public money globally to curb the increasingly serious issue. "We are losing our ability to treat infections," Keiji Fukuda, a senior World Health Organization official in charge of anti-microbial resistance, told AFP. "Not only does it threaten to increase deaths but our whole ability to handle patients is threatened. It also threatens our ability to grow enough food," he said, pointing to superbacteria's effects on crops and livestock.

A recent British study found that the development of super-resistant bacteria could contribute to the deaths of 10 million people per

NEW YORK: World leaders today will for the first year worldwide by 2050 — about the same number who die from different forms of cancer. Currently some 700,000 deaths a year around the world are attributed to anti-microbial resistance, including 23,000 in the United States. Fukuda said that future death forecasts are just estimates, with reliable data not available in many countries. But experts hope the grim figures will help draw public attention to the seriousness of the problem.

Worries for research

The dangers originate with the overuse or misuse of antimicrobials-chief among them antibiotics-around the world. The risks come not only with animals but with livestock, where antibiotics are used on a massive scale not only to treat animals but to pump up their size. The super-resistant bacteria can come into humans through water contamination or animal waste, or through meat. Resistance to bacteria was discovered as early as the 1950s by Alexander Fleming, the discoverer of penicillin. But the problem has only reached worrying proportions in recent years, aggravated by the absence of new antibiotics, Fukuda said.

These days a growing number of people find their bodies resistant to drugs to treat not just obscure diseases, but commonplace ones like

skin and blood ailments, or urinary tract infection. Among the most difficult infections to treat are tuberculosis, with the United Nations saying that some 480,000 people each year develop a form of the illness resistant to antibiotics. Also increasingly difficult to treat are hospital-acquired illnesses and sexually transmitted diseases such as gonorrhea. "We have not come up with any new class of antibiotics in at least two decades. There is a dry pipeline," Fukuda said. For pharmaceutical companies, research has not appeared profitable with uncertain prospects for profit.

Gradual recognition of seriousness

But Fukuda said there has been a growing recognition of the problem in recent years, including in emerging economies such as Thailand. Several countries, mostly in Scandinavia, have sought to curtail the use of antibiotics, with Norway eradicating their use in captive fish farms. Leaders of the World Bank and the Group of 20 major economies have recently voiced concern about the effect of rising super-bacterias in global growth and

the fight against poverty. For Fukuda, superbacteria have finally become a "big societal threat." "Just like we saw with climate change or HIV. That is the transition we are seeing right now," he said. — AFP

PRO-PAINKILLER ECHO CHAMBER SHAPED POLICY AMID DRUG EPIDEMIC

Honolulu, Hawaii: For more than a decade, members of a little-known group called the Pain Care Forum have blanketed Washington with messages about prescription painkillers' vital role in the lives of millions of Americans, creating an echo chamber that has quietly derailed efforts to curb US consumption of drugs like OxyContin, Vicodin and Percocet.

In 2012, drugmakers and their affiliates in the forum sent a letter to US senators promoting a recent report on a "crisis of epidemic proportions": pain in America. Few knew the report stemmed from legislation drafted and pushed by forum members and that their experts had helped author it. The report estimated more than 100 million Americans - roughly 40 percent of adults - suffered from chronic pain, an eye-popping statistic that some researchers call deeply problematic. The letter made no reference, however, to another health issue that had been declared an epidemic by federal authorities: drug overdoses tied to prescription painkillers. Deaths linked to addictive opioid drugs had increased more than fourfold since 1999, accounting for more deaths in 2012 than heroin and cocaine combined.

Prescribed medications

Internal memo

By spring 2014, even the head of the Food and Drug Administration was citing the statistic that 100 million Americans suffered from chronic pain. Then-commissioner Margaret Hamburg used the figure to illustrate the importance of keeping painkillers accessible - despite the escalating toll of opioid addiction and abuse. Yet a researcher whose work contributed to the number said it was being misquoted, since most people included in the figure had common pain ailments and managed them without opioids.

Hamburg said in an emailed response that the report was "another piece of scientific literature that helped inform the broader field," and that her agency had no role in writing it. When the FDA began developing plans to reduce misuse of longacting opioids, the Pain Care Forum intervened with a "strategy to inform the process," according to an internal memo from the American Pain Foundation, a nowdefunct forum member. The FDA's initial proposals included requiring doctors to undergo certification training to prescribe opioids and tracking opioid prescriptions via databases. But when the FDA sought public comment on how to proceed, the forum helped generate more than 2,000 comments against new barriers to opioids and a 4,000-signature petition opposing electronic registries, according to another pain foundation memo. Ultimately, the agency announced far milder steps than its initial ideas: Drugmakers would fund optional classes for doctors and supply brochures to patients about opioid risks. FDA leaders said they decided requiring certification for prescribers would have been overly burdensome, disrupting care for patients and doctors. But experts said regulators had missed a pivotal chance to curb deadly misuse and abuse with the drugs. "The FDA failed to make a decision that could have averted many of the thousands of deaths we're seeing per year," said Dr Nathaniel Katz, a former FDA adviser who urged the agency to make training mandatory for prescribers. Today, the FDA is taking another look at requiring training for opioid prescribers, following a recommendation by a panel of expert advisers in May.

MIAMI'S WYNWOOD CLEARED OF ZIKA; FOCUS SHIFTS TO MIAMI BEACH

MIAMI: With health authorities declaring a win ter) area encompassing most of 7-mile-long (11against Zika in Miami's Wynwood arts district, their emphasis shifts to the remaining transmission zone on nearby Miami Beach, where residents have objected to the aerial pesticide spraying crediting with halting infections. No new cases of Zika have been reported in Wynwood since early August, and on Monday health officials declared it to be no longer a zone of active local transmission. The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention lifted a warning for pregnant women to stay out of Wynwood altogether, but continued to caution them about traveling to the city and surrounding areas out of concerns for catching the virus, which can cause serious birth defects. In nearby Miami Beach, health officials have broadened their declared zone of active local transmission.

Florida Gov Rick Scott and CDC officials attributed the drop-off in infections in Wynwood to aggressive aerial spraying with naled, an insecticide that targets adult mosquitoes, and street-level spraying with another pesticide that kills mosquito larvae. Scott said residents and business owners who kept their properties clear of standing water also helped. "We're doing everything we can do to educate the public and have the same success in Miami Beach as we have in Wynwood," Scott said.

Insects can breed

Wynwood was the first place on the US mainland where mosquitoes began transmitting Zika. Health officials say that over the past several weeks, mosquito control workers there have seen fewer of the insects, the main culprits in spreading the virus. "The message with Wynwood is it was a huge success," said Dr Lyle Petersen of the CDC. "This outbreak would have kept going without the aerial spraying." But despite months of public outreach and aggressive mosquito control measures, including the removal of cylinder-shaped tropical plants that trap water where insects can breed, Florida health officials have continued to find Zika-carrving mosquitoes in Miami Beach.

Miami Beach's tall buildings and ocean breezes make aerial spraying of naled there more difficult than in Wynwood, Petersen said. Many residents there have objected to the aerial spraving despite assurances from health officials that they are using concentrations of the chemical that are safe for humans. The city's infection zone has expanded from just South Beach to a 4.5-square-mile (12-square kilomekilometer long) island, Scott's office announced late Friday.

A plane contracted by Miami-Dade County mosquito control officials sprayed naled over South Beach on Sunday. It was the city's third aerial spraying. A fourth is scheduled Saturday. Of 85 non-travel-related Zika cases in Florida residents, 31 were associated with Wynwood and 36 with Miami Beach, Florida Department of Health spokeswoman Mara Gambineri said in an email Monday. Another 10 people who aren't Florida residents also have contracted Zika in the state.

Reassuring residents

Zika infections are mild for most people but can cause severe brain-related birth defects, including a dangerously small head, if women are infected during pregnancy. Local officials and business leaders joined Scott at a Wynwood art gallery to try and reassure residents and tourists fearful of Zika. "It's a great day in Wynwood. Everybody, please come back," Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos Gimenez said. Zak Stern was offering free lunches for pregnant women visiting his Wynwood bakery, Zak the Baker, to celebrate the state's announcement. He couldn't estimate how much Zika had affected his business, but he questioned whether the response to the outbreak was proportionate to the risk.

"The business owners, they were trying to make it seem like it's not such a big deal. The government was trying to show that they were doing something. The press was trying to show a story. The public was stuck in the middle, misinformed and afraid," Stern said. Stern lives just north of the infection zone in Miami Beach, and his wife is due to give birth in about a month. He said the couple has tried to balance Zika with other safety recommendations for pregnant women.

"They tell you that you can't eat sushi, and they tell you that you can't eat soft cheese, and they tell that you can't drink, right? And now they're telling you that you can't go outside," he said. "Zika or no Zika, things can happen." — AP

and the Center for Public Integrity reveals that similar feedback loops of information and influence play out regularly in the nation's capital, fueled by money and talking points from the Pain Care Forum, a loose coalition of drugmakers, trade groups and dozens of nonprofits supported by industry funding that has flown under the radar until now. Hundreds of internal documents shed new light on how drugmakers and their allies shaped the national response to the ongoing wave of prescription opioid abuse, which has claimed the lives of 165,000 Americans since 2000, according to federal figures.

Painkillers are among the most widely prescribed medications in the US, but pharmaceutical companies and allied groups have a multitude of legislative interests beyond those drugs. From 2006 through 2015, participants in the Pain Care Forum spent over \$740 million lobbying in the nation's capital and in all 50 statehouses on an array of issues, including keeping opioids accessible, according to an analysis of lobbying filings.

The same organizations reinforced their influence with more than \$140 million doled out to political campaigns, including more than \$75 million alone to federal candidates, political action committees and parties. "You can go a long, long way in getting what you want when you have a lot of money," said Professor Keith Humphreys of Stanford University, a former adviser on drug policy under President Barack Obama. "And it's only when things get so disastrous that finally there's enough popular will aroused to push back."

Opioids were long reserved for severe pain due to surgery, injury or terminal diseases like cancer. That changed in the 1990s, with a surge in prescribing for more common ailments like back pain and arthritis. Marketing for new long-acting painkillers like OxyContin helped fuel the trend, along with other factors. OxyContinmaker Purdue Pharma pleaded guilty and agreed to pay more than \$600 million in fines in 2007 for misleading the public about the risks of its drug. But the painkiller continued to rack up blockbuster sales, generating more than \$22 billion over the last decade.

Purdue's Washington lobbyist, Burt Rosen, co-founded the Pain Care Forum more than a decade ago and coordinates the group's monthly meetings in Washington. Purdue declined to make Rosen available for interviews and did not answer questions about its specific lobbying activities.

The company said it supports a range of advocacy groups, including some with differing views on opioids. "In practice and governance, the Pain Care Forum is like any of the hundreds of policy coalitions in Washington and throughout the nation," the company said in a statement, adding:

Legal Foundation

It was a federal agency hundreds of miles from Washington that finally sidestepped the influence of the Pain Care Forum. Earlier this year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, located in Atlanta, overcame threats of congressional investigation and legal action to publish the first federal guidelines intended to reduce opioid prescribing. Essentially, the agency said the risks of painkillers outweigh the benefits for the vast majority of patients with routine chronic pain and that doctors instead should consider alternatives like physical therapy.

When draft guidelines emerged in September, forum members said they were not based on solid evidence, and criticized the CDC for not disclosing outside experts who had advised its effort. One pharmaaligned group, the Washington Legal Foundation, said the lack of disclosure constituted a "clear violation" of federal law. A longtime Pain Care Forum participant now known as the Academy of Integrative Pain Management - asked Congress to investigate how the CDC developed the guidelines, though investigators found no violations.

After months of scrutiny, the CDC in December released a list of its advisers. One of 17 "core experts" had served as a paid consultant to a law firm suing opioid drugmakers. The final guidelines appeared in March.

The first recommendation for US doctors was unequivocal: "Opioids are not firstline therapy" for routine chronic pain. It was a statement considered common practice by many doctors as recently as the early 1990s, a decade before the Pain Care Forum formed in Washington. —AP

CHINA SHIP OWNERS PAY UP FOR AUSTRALIA REEF DISASTER

SYDNEY: The owners of a Chinese ship that ran aground on the Great Barrier Reef in 2010 agreed to pay Australia Aus\$39.3 million (US\$29.6 million) on Monday, in a settlement dismissed by conservationists as "woefully inadequate".

The fully-laden coal carrier Shen Neng 1 hit a shoal in April 2010, leaking tons of heavy fuel oil and threatening an ecological disaster. While a catastrophe was avoided, the huge ship gouged a three-kilometer (1.8-mile) scar in the coral and was stranded for nine days before salvage workers refloated it.

The ship's owner, Shenzhen Energy Transport Co Ltd, and its insurer refused for six years to accept responsibility to make restitution before striking Monday's out-ofcourt settlement. "Our ongoing actions to pursue funds to clean up the pollution sends an unambiguous signal that damage to the Great Barrier Reef World Heritage Area is unacceptable," said Environment Minister Josh Frydenberg. He added that the settlement showed Australia would "use every available means to pursue ship owners who are negligent in causing damage to the reef".

But Greenpeace Australia slammed the deal, calling it "woefully inadequate". "The government has said the full clean-up will cost more than Aus\$140m so to settle for such a small figure is disappointing," said Greenpeace's Pacific reef campaigner Shani Tager. "While we welcome the end of this six-year saga, it has to serve as a reminder that accidents happen. It's clear that coal and the reef don't mix and the government needs to do more to protect this precious place."

The funds will allow the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority to remove toxic anti-fouling paint and rubble, which will allow the reef to be restored, the government said. But it will be a long haul, with the anti-fouling paint containing a highly toxic component which is now banned from use. "Impacts to marine life on the seafloor could potentially last for many decades if the toxic anti-fouling paint remains in place," Frydenberg said. The ship's owner had argued the reef was selfhealing and the company should not have to pay the bill.

An Australian investigation in 2011 blamed a tired chief mate for the accident. It also found the ship's safety management system did not contain procedures or guidance in relation to the proper use of passage plans, including electronic route plans. Conservationists said the incident highlighted the environmental risks to the Great Barrier Reef, particularly from shipping Australian exports to China. —AFP

JUST HOW MUCH SUGAR DO AMERICANS CONSUME? IT'S COMPLICATED

'SUGAR IS A PROBLEM, BUT SUGAR IS NOT THE ONLY PROBLEM'

NEW YORK: Sugar has become the nutritional villain du jour, but just how bad is our addiction? The answer is tricky. Philadelphia recently passed a tax on sugary drinks, several other places have proposed them, and the government this year recommended we limit our intake of added sugars to 10 percent of daily calories, underscoring how significant elected officials believe the problem is. But while determining exactly how much sugar we're consuming is a complicated business - government figures are estimates- the data and industry trends indicate we've actually made progress in cutting back.

On average, Americans' total consumption of caloric sweeteners like refined cane sugar and high-fructose corn syrup is down 15 percent from its peak in 1999, according to government data. That's when we consumed an average of 111 grams of sugar a day (423 calories). After plateauing in recent years, consumption was down to 94 grams a day (358 calories) last year, according to the US Department of Agriculture, which calculates the figures by estimating how much of the caloric sweeteners produced are never eaten. But that level is still higher than the 87 grams Americans consumed on average in 1970. A major factor for the drop appears to be the decline in soda consumption, as the high-fructose corn syrup used to sweeten drinks like Sprite and Mountain Dew has been on the decline. Thomas Farley, the health commissioner in Philadelphia, said it could take many years before the positive effects from the reductions in soda consumption to turn up in health data. But he also noted that factors like the growth in snacking, the availability of food in more places, and oversized restaurant dishes can fuel obesity.

Limit added sugar

"Sugar is a problem, but sugar is not the only problem," Farley said. And though it's lower, sweetener consumption of 94 grams a day is still the equivalent of roughly two and half cans of Coke. That far exceeds the government's recommendation to limit added sugar to around 50 grams a day (200 calories) for someone on a 2,000-calorie diet. Notably, a per capita consumption figure doesn't account for the wide disparities in intake among individuals. The way the USDA estimates sweetener consumption also means the specific figure could be higher or lower. The agency changed its methodology in 2012, which meant a sharp reduction in how much sugar it said we consume. Emails obtained by the Center for Science in the Public Interest, which supports soda taxes, show that a sugar industry group wanted the change and hoped for "as low a per capita sweetener consumption estimate as

Sweet taste boosters

The American Beverage Association, the trade group for Coke and Pepsi, says soda isn't the driver of obesity rates, since those levels have climbed as soda drinking has declined. Gary Taubes, a science author, believes the influx of sweeteners and refined carbohydrates in diets has likely fueled obesity, but notes there's ambiguity in the evidence. And Cristin Kearns, a former dentist who has been uncovering documents showing the sugar industry's influence on nutrition science, noted that "manufacturers are getting crafty" about the types of sweeteners they use, such as juice concentrate, meaning they might not show up in consumption figures.

As sugar comes under fire, food companies are using sophisticated new methods to reduce sweeteners without sacrificing sweetness. Consider the use of "sweet taste boosters" that amplify smaller amounts of sweeteners. The ingredients are listed as "artificial flavors" on packages, according to Senomyx, a California company that makes them. Earlier this year, MycoTechnology began making a "bitter blocker" that reduces the need for sweeteners that mask bitterness. The Colorado company says it is made from a mushroom extract and can be listed as a "natural flavor." Some companies have also switched back to "real sugar" to give their products a more wholesome image, even though there may be no difference in calories. While the overall decline in sweeteners reflects the drop in high-fructose corn syrup, the consumption of refined sugar has actually edged up in recent years. In that small regard, sugar is enjoying a revival. — AP

ORPHANED BABY KOALA FINDS FLUFFY TOY FRIEND

SYDNEY: An orphaned baby koala in Australia has found solace cuddling a fluffy toy marsupial in the absence of his mother as he recovers from the trauma of her death. Nine-month-old Shayne's mother was recently hit and killed by a car in Queensland state as he clung to her back. Rescuers found the joey had been thrown 20 meters down the road by the impact and was being chased by crows. The baby was taken to the Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital, run by the family of "Crocodile Hunter" Steve Irwin, where doctors said he was overcoming his terrifying ordeal with the help of a toy koala as he learns to be independent.

"Shayne has no injuries as a result of the accident, instead, he's dealing with the loss of his mum and the vital life lessons he needs to learn in order to become an independent, wild koala," hospital director Rosie Booth said Monday. At the hospital Shayne, his black button nose and bushy ears visible above the soft pink blanket he was swaddled in, clung onto the back of the toy koala as he might his real mother.

"It's very fortunate that we had an observant rescuer who found Shayne and brought him into us because he wouldn't have lasted even a day in the wild by himself at his young age-now he gets a second chance at life," Booth said. The muchloved koala has been under increasing threat across Australia in recent decades, particularly from habitat loss, disease, dog attacks and bushfires. The hospital treats an average of 70 to 80 koalas every month. A 2012 national count placed total Koala numbers at around 330,000, though their treetop habitat makes accurate assessment difficult. —AFP

There's always room for "improvement and refinement" in making food consumption estimates, said Michael McConnell, an agriculture economist who specializes in sweeteners at the USDA. But he said the change in methodology was applied retroactively, so any trend the numbers show would still be consistent. Even if the numbers are inexact, others agree the downward trajectory in sweeteners makes sense. That's because soda consumption started falling around the same time, and is down 24 percent since 1998, according to industry tracker Beverage Digest. Michael Jacobson, executive director of the CSPI, thinks it's a major factor and perhaps the entire reason - for the drop in sweetener consumption.

uminaries from the film, music and writing worlds honored Tom Waits and folk singer John Prine for their songwriting at the Song Lyrics of Literary Excellence Awards on Monday. Waits' wife, Kathleen Brennan, also was honored. John Mellencamp, Elvis Costello and Roseanne Cash took turns performing renditions of the artists' songs before a crowd of more than 500 people at the John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum.

Mellencamp opened the ceremony with an a cappella version of Prine's 1978 song "Sabu Visits the Twin Cities Alone," which imagines the later years of an Indian child actor from the early 1940s. Mellencamp called the lyrics "sophisticated but simple." "Who writes songs like that?" he said. "Two people come to mind - God and John Prine." Irish author Colum McCann, director Jim Jarmusch, country singer Sturgill Simpson and Peter Wolf of the J. Geils Band reflected on the artists' accomplishments in remarks that ranged from personal to poetic. McCann described Waits and Brennan as "patriots of elsewhere" who stay "close to the ground" and "hear things that no one else hears."

"They find out what others have not quite fathomed yet," he said. "They catch the ordinary so that it can be sung extraordinarily in the future." Waits and Prine each treated the crowd to a song after giving brief remarks. Prine, whose voice has become deep and raspy following a battle with cancer that required removal of part of his neck, said he was "stunned" by the honor. Waits reflected on working with Brennan, his longtime musical collaborator, who became the first woman to win the award since it was introduced in 2012. "It's not always fun writing together," Waits said in a humorous, sometimes rambling speech. "Sometimes the fur flies. It's not an easy enterprise, but it's satisfying."

Brennan, speaking briefly before her husband, said she has a "lay low" personality and isn't always accustomed to the spotlight. Waits and Prine, now in their late 60s, emerged in the 1970s and have been performing for decades. Waits gained notoriety for his blend of jazz, blues and folk music and his distinctive growl. Prine wrote many songs that have become folk and country standards. Cash, joined by Costello on acoustic guitar, performed one of those, "Hello in There," about old age and loneliness, from Prine's 1971 debut album. The Song Lyrics of Literary Excellence Award is bestowed biennially by the writers' group PEN New England. This year's honorees were chosen by a committee that included U2's Bono, Cash, Costello and Salman Rushdie. The first awards were given to Chuck Berry and Leonard Cohen in 2012. The 2014 awards went to Kris Kristofferson and Randy Newman. — AP

FARC guerrilla raps for peace in Colombia

ohn Esteban Perez was 13 when he joined the FARC rebels in Colombia. Now 26, he has spent half his life as a guerrilla. But today, instead of hiding out in the jungle with his rifle, he has fellow rebels bouncing to his rhymes as he raps for peace. "They say we're bad, we're rapists. That's all lies. We're working for peace, peace, peace in Colombia," he rapped Saturday night at the FARC's national conference, where the rebels are meeting to ratify a peace accord with the Colombian government. The deal, concluded last month, aims to end to five decades of conflict that have killed an estimated 260,000 people and left 45,000 missing. It is a historic moment for the country and the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC), a Marxist guerrilla army that has been fighting the government since 1964. But this being Colombiawhere nothing happens without music-the conference is also a nightly dance party. One of the bands booked to perform, the Bogota reggae group Alerta Kamarada, discovered Esteban's talent while

they were doing sound checks ahead of Saturday's show, on a stage set up in the middle of a field at the heart of the rebels' traditional stronghold in southeastern Colombia.

He got up on stage, dropped some beats, and seduced them with his style-energetic, politically charged rhymes laid out over tropical rhythms. Next thing he knew, he had an invitation to guest star at their show. "We're very proud we were able to cross paths with him," said Alerta Kamarada guitarist and band leader Pablo Araoz, 36. "We fell in love with his style," he added. "We would love to keep working with him. He's a talent."

they are expected to do-their leader, Timoleon "Timochenko" Jimenez, will sign it alongside President Juan Manuel Santos on September 26. Colombians will then vote on the deal in a decisive referendum on October 2. If it passes, the FARC have pledged to disarm and relaunch themselves as a political party.

Jim Carrey calls lawsuit over ex's death 'heartless'

im Carrey says a wrongful death lawsuit filed by the estranged husband of his ex-girlfriend is a heartless attempt to exploit him and vowed to fight the case. Mark Burton of Portland sued Carrey in Los Angeles Superior Court on Monday, accusing the actor of providing the prescription drugs his wife Cathriona White used to overdose in September 2015. The wrongful death lawsuit contends Carrey improperly obtained prescriptions for Ambien and the powerful opioid oxycodone under the alias Arthur King. The suit accuses Carrey of giving White the medications days before she was found dead in one of Carrey's homes. White and Carrey dated in 2012 and were photographed together in May 2015. "What a terrible shame," Carrey wrote in a statement. "It would be easy for me to get in a back room with this man's lawyer and make this go away, but there are some moments in life when you have to stand up and defend your honor against the evil in this world. "I will not tolerate this heartless attempt to exploit me or the woman I loved," Carrey wrote. "I really hope that some day soon people will stop trying to profit from this and let her rest in peace." Carrey is known for such movies as "Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind," "The Truman Show," and "Ace Ventura: Pet Detective." Coroner's officials ruled the 30-year-old makeup artist's death a suicide. Burton and White married in 2013. A coroner's official told reporters that the pair were separated and planned to divorce, however Burton's attorney Michael Avenatti declined to characterize their relationship beyond saying they were legally married at the time of White's death. Carrey's attorney Marty Singer wrote in a statement that White and Burton never lived together. The lawsuit accuses Carrey of violating a section of California's Health and Safety Code against the use of aliases to obtain prescription medications.

London Fashion Week hits climax with Burberry, Erdem





uxury British fashion house Burberry unveiled its highly anticipated display at London Fashion Week Monday, an opulent affair featuring frilly blouses, velvet blazers and silky pajama shirts - for both men and women. Elsewhere, Christopher Kane and Erdem were among designers showing off their newest collections to the fashion pack before they jet off to Milan. Some highlights from Day 4 of the fashion week:

Post-gender opulence at Burberry

Soaring live orchestral music, opera singers, an imposing new show venue complete with classical sculptures: Burberry's latest display is a very grand affair indeed. So it comes as no surprise that the clothes on show are just as opulent. Minimalism had no place here: The luxury British brand's new collection featured flamboyant military coats, frilly high collars reminiscent of portraits of Queen Elizabeth I, rich velvet and brocade, and silky pajamas layered under floral jackets - designs intended for both genders.

For the first time, the target audience isn't just female fashion fans. Monday's show marked a move by Burberry to merge its traditionally separate women's and menswear shows. Fittingly, creative director Christopher Bailey said he was inspired by Virginia Woolf's novel "Orlando," whose hero is a poet who changes gender from man to woman.

"I was looking for this idea of fluidity of gender, fluidity of travel, and I love the poetry in 'Orlando," Bailey told The Associated Press backstage.

The heritage brand also introduced another first: Fans can "shop the show" straightaway, both online and in-store.



The move, also introduced by several other brands this season, is seen as an industry game-changer. Traditionally, fashion shows are exclusive previews intended only for industry insiders, and ordinary consumers have to wait months before the new styles are released. Not anymore. An elaborate python and ostrich leather handbag shown Monday went on sale immediately - at a formidable \$2,660 each. The new strategy may stoke more buying interest from fashionistas, but whether it brings in more profit is something that remains to be seen.

Romantic shipwreck at Erdem

A shipwreck has never looked so elegant or darkly romantic. Canada-born designer Erdem Moralioglu always infuses his shows with a sense of drama and haunting beauty, and this time is no different. Models wore large floppy black hats that obscured their faces, gliding on a weathered boardwalk that appeared to weave in and out of water. The dreamy clothes reflected the brooding nautical theme, crafted in washed-out shades of blue and silvery grey, and all the frocks seemed to be covered in miles of rolling ruffles, lace, frills and velvet ribbons.

As always with Erdem, the devil is in the couture-like level of detail. Little gemstones twinkle on brocade gowns, and some of the embroidery is stunning in its intricacy, especially the rich Oriental-style florals overlaid on sheer delicate fabrics. For many, Erdem's creations may be too much like costumes for a period drama. But at a time when much of fashion is so disposable, it's pleasing to see a designer insist on making every piece a work of art.

Fashionistas take over the Tate modern for Kane

Museum-goers could be forgiven for wondering where all the odd, funny shoes came from as the fashion crowd descended like a cloud of overdressed locusts at the usually staid Tate Britain on the banks of the River Thames. With American Vogue editor Anna Wintour presiding in the front row at the Christopher Kane show, guests arrived with an emphasis on sparkly boots and heels, with green and silver sequins predominating. There were mustard thigh-high boots, silver patent leather shoes with tassels, and pointy black-and-red suede ankle boots with heels shaped like a sailboat's winged keels.

Once the show began, the shoes were quickly overshadowed by Kane's eclectic creations. Known for his edgy designs and his references to modern art, some of the dresses took a Jackson Pollack approach to color and relied on wildly clashing patterns to carry the look. Despite the museum setting, there is nothing safe or conventional about Kane's approach. Some of the three-quarter-length coats were ripped for impact's sake, and some of the elegant dresses had cutaways and high-tech mesh panels.

Long black gloves were meant to be iconoclastic - not a nod to ballet days - and were decorated with colors and cutouts. The former wunderkind's own label is now 10 years old, but he isn't repeating himself. Some of the multicolored coat designs had a fresh, fevered look, covering dresses that evoked a similar mood if not similar colors or patterns. Some of the dresses sported dozens of metallic hooks, some closed to keep the ensembles together, others serving no apparent structural purpose. Many were set off by Stephen Jones' distinctive hats, often in solid colors to offset the controlled chaos of the ensembles. — AP











Supermodel Kate Moss launches own agency

Ate Moss is launching her own talent agency after leaving the one that recruited her aged 14 earlier this year, the Business of Fashion website reported as London Fashion Week draws to a close yesterday. "I don't really want pretty people, I want people that want to sing and dance and act. I want to create stars," the 42-year-old was quoted as saying in a rare interview after her departure from Storm Models. "I want to focus more on managing people's careers than just a modeling agency," said Moss, whose agency has a website, Twitter and Instagram presence despite her own wellknown avoidance of social media. London-born Moss, the daughter of a barmaid and a travel agent, was recruited in a chance encounter at New York airport and is one of the few supermodels from the 1990s who still has a lucrative career. In the interview published on Monday, Business of Fashion said the model's eponymously named Kate Moss Agency "could transform her from supermodel to budding businesswoman".

Moss is the 12th highest-paid model globally, earning \$4.5 million (four million euros) in the year to June 2015, according to US magazine Forbes. In a sign of her longevity in the industry, Moss recently modeled for Calvin Klein-more than two decades after she was first photographed for the company. She shot to fame in the 1990s and was swiftly labelled the epitome of "heroin chic"-a fashion trend blamed for glamorizing drugs and anorexia. Despite a string of scandalsincluding photographs allegedly showing her taking cocaine-Moss's image has survived each episode unscathed. She is adored by fashion bible Vogue, adorning its cover dozens of times and serving as contributing editor for British Vogue in 2014. While modeling for the world's major fashion houses such as Versace and Yves Saint Laurent, Moss has also signed up with high street make-up brand Rimmel and collaborated with clothing store Topshop. — AFP









Mali unveils restored mosque nearly destroyed by jihadists

The doors of a revered 15th-century mosque hacked apart by jihadists in Mali's ancient city of Timbuktu four years ago were unveiled on Monday restored to their former glory. The "secret door" of the Sidi Yahia mosque in the fabled caravan city fell victim to a spree of destruction in 2012 by Al-Qaeda-linked Ansar Dine, one of several radical Islamist groups which seized key northern cities that year. Around 100 Malian political and religious leaders, diplomats and representatives from world heritage body UNESCO gathered for a ceremony, held with a heavy security presence, an AFP journalist at the scene reported. "This is a very important day," said the mosque's imam, Alphadi Wandara. "Since (the days) of our forefathers, for centuries the door has been like that: closed."

Muslim prayers were recited for the mosque, which has been on UNESCO's list of world heritage sites since 1988. UNESCO craftsmen had spent five months restoring the doors this year. Former teacher Ahmad Al-Faqi Al-Mahdi, who took part in wrecking Timbuktu's holy shrines as well as the mosque's doors, is currently awaiting a sentence on war crimes charges in The Hague for his actions. Sidi Yahia was among several sites in Timbuktu attacked by Ansar Dine, which considered the city's mausoleums idolatrous according to their strict interpretation of Islam.

Timbuktu youth leader Salah Maiga told AFP he had witnessed the jihadists' campaign with his own eyes. "For us it is a symbol, which was destroyed in plain view," he said. "We were there with these barbarians, these lawless people without religion, who claim to speak in the name of Islam," Maiga added, saying he hoped for justice in Mahdi's case. Mahdi has admitted the charges against him and prosecutors are asking for a jail term of 11 years at his sentencing on September 27.



Ansar Dine picked out Mahdi to head its "Hisbah" brigade, which policed infractions of Islamist behaviour in Timbuktu. Revered as a centre of Islamic learning during its golden age in the 15th and 16th centuries, Timbuktu in northern Mali is also known as the "Pearl of the Desert". — AFP The site of the Cheick Sidi Attawaty Mausoleum which was destroyed by Islamists in 2012 and rebuilt in 2015, is seen in the Three Saints Cemetery in Timbuktu.
