MASTER THEIR LANGUAGE

read a column by Dr Suad Al-Sabah in Al-Rai yesterday about a topic that has been on my mind for many years. Guys, it's about the decline of our beautiful Arabic language. Thanks to Dr Suad for her effort in raising this serious issue, especially how it's being taught to children. As a language, it should be taught when you are young - anything you learn when you are very young will stay in your memory. Children are like sponges - they absorb everything, and especially languages, 100 times better than when they are older.

I still remember poetry that I was taught in school at the age of six or seven. If you give me two lines of a poem today to memorize, I think it will take me one week. With regards to Arabic, I want to also add another aspect that needs discussing - that as adults, we are ignoring our language. I have noticed that in many societies, English is prevailing. Even when we are walking or talking as a family or with friends, we are not using Arabic - even our slang is mostly English. The problem is that many of us started to consid er speaking English as a mark of status. Wow. Cool. I hear young Arab mothers at the co-op or at the airport or shops talking to their children in English. They seem to be more focused on demonstrating to everyone that they know English and that their kids know English, rather than really communicating with their children. Sometimes, I even laugh as some of them make mistakes while speaking, but insist to keep speaking in English. I'm not against any language and I love languages, actually. I'm writing in English because this is an English-language paper and there is no harm in this. All our kids should know English and other languages of the world. But first let's master our own language and this is what my generation was forced to do. Master Arabic before learning a second language. I understand that the whole world has become a village, and thanks to globalization, our interaction with the rest of the world is mainly in English. So that maybe is one of the reasons why many people want their children to learn English. Also, the social system in Kuwait means that children are often exposed to domestic help from Asian countries and often end up communicating in English. Despite all these snags, we should try our best and concentrate more on learning Arabic and force our children to master their native tongue as early as possible.

ERDOGAN SLAMS CRITICISM OF TURKISH REFERENDUM AMIR CONGRATULATES PRESIDENT

The referendum was seen as crucial not just for shaping Turkey's political system but also the future strategic direction of a nation that has been a NATO member since 1952 and a European Union hopeful for half a century.

KUWAIT: The administrative court yesterday set May 8 to start hearing a case demanding a total ban on expatriates driving until the government has resolved the traffic problem on the country's roads. The case was filed by lawyer Mohammad Al-Ansari on behalf of a number of Kuwaiti citizens, who charged that the government has failed to resolve traffic congestions on roads and asked the court to intervene to help solve the problem.

The lawyer demanded a total suspension of all driving licenses held by expatriates and also to stop giving new licenses to foreigners until a solution is found to the traffic problems. The lawyer and his clients are demanding to keep all expatriate drivers off the road to allow easy access to Kuwaiti motorists to go to work and return.

There have been calls by some Kuwaiti lawmakers to this effect. MP Safaa Al-Hashem, the sole female MP, has called for suspending licenses for expatriates for one year until a solution is found to the traffic problem. The calls have been described as racist by the independent Kuwait Society for Human Rights and a number of MPs. The court is not expected to accept the lawsuit, and if it does so, it will be challenged at the appeals and supreme courts to become final.

Meanwhile, acting speaker Essa Al-Kandari yesterday called for restraint in using grillings and urged MPs to resort to lesser constitutional tools in questioning ministers. He said that resorting to the grilling tool all the time is likely to weaken this important constitutional tool, and at the same time, fail to resolve problems facing citizens and could lead to straining relations between the Assembly and the government.

Kandari said citizens are fed up from the continued escalation of tensions between the executive and legislature authorities, adding that the constitution has made cooperation the basis of relations between the two bodies ahead of confrontations. Kandari's call comes a day after two opposition lawmakers filed a motion to grill the prime minister, the second grilling in the past few days.

LAYOFFS, 'DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION' AT THE NATIONAL

DUBAI: A state-backed newspaper in the United Arab Emirates that was bought by an Emirati who oversees the English football club Manchester City is undergoing layoffs, those with knowledge of the firings said yesterday. They told AP that staffers at The National were informed Sunday they had been let go. They spoke to the AP on condition of anonymity for fear of repercussions. It wasn't clear how wide the layoffs were or what specific plans The National's new owner had for the daily newspaper. Repeated calls to the newspaper rang unanswered yesterday.

The layoffs come after months of turmoil at The National, which was founded in 2008 and staffed with top writers and editors from Western newspapers. Its owner, the state-backed firm Abu Dhabi Media, hoped

it would become the Mideast's standard for independent, hard-nosed newspapering. But while the paper broke local stories on skyscraper fire safety and other issues, it largely stayed away from controversial topics in a country with strict laws governing speech.

International Media Investments, a subsidiary of Abu Dhabi Media Investment Corp owned by Sheikh Mansour bin Zayed Al-Nahyan of Manchester City, bought The National in November from Abu Dhabi Media. Sheikh Mansour's media firm has a joint venture with Britain-based Sky to run the Arab satellite news channel Sky News Arabia. In a statement, International Media Investments said: "The National is putting together its team, made of existing and new talent," and will

undergo "a digital transformation while retaining its print product". It answered no questions from the AP about the layoffs.

Although the newspaper sale has yet to finalize, staffers had to reapply for jobs at the paper. Sources close to the process said the post of chief editor could go to Mina Al-Oraibi, the former assistant editor of Saudi newspaper Asharq Al-Awsat. All this comes as low global oil prices have pinched the economy of the United Arab Emirates, a federation of seven sheikhdoms on the Arabian Peninsula. Sheikh Mansour is a member of the ruling family of Abu Dhabi, the UAE's oil-rich capital. He also serves as a deputy prime minister and minister of presidential affairs. — Agencies

PALESTINIANS IN ISRAELI **AILS ON HUNGER STRIKE**

RAMALLAH: Hundreds of Palestinians in Israeli jails launched a hunger strike yesterday following a call from leader and prominent prisoner Marwan Barghouti, a movement that could mark a serious challenge to Israeli authorities if sustained.

The hunger strike was called in connection with Palestinian Prisoners Day, observed annually, but also ahead of commemorations this summer marking 50 years since the 1967 Six-Day War and the start of

Israel's occupation. Israel Prisons Service spokesman Assaf Librati said that hunger strikers would be disciplined and later added that Barghouti had been transferred from Hadarim prison to Jalami prison, near Haifa, 48 km to the north. Qaddura Fares, head of the Palestinian Prisoners' Club which tracks the well-being of Palestinians in Israeli jails, said Barghouti had been

SAUDI SEEKS 10% RENEWABLE **ENERGY IN 6 YEARS: MINISTER**

to come from renewable sources within several years as part of a transformation in its power sector, the energy minister said yesterday. Khaled Al-Falih said his country, the world's biggest oil exporter, will also sell renewable

energy and its technology abroad. At a forum seeking investment in the sector, he announced "30 projects to be implemented" in order to reach a goal of about 10 gigawatts of renewable energy production early next decade.

Virtually all of the kingdom's domestic power currently comes from crude, refined oil or natural gas. But as part of an economic reform plan to wean the kingdom off oil, the government has embarked on what Falih called an "ambitious" renewables program featuring solar and wind power. He has said the projects could cost between \$30 billion and \$50 billion. "The percentage of renewable energy by 2023 will represent 10 percent of the total electricity of the kingdom," he said at the start of the

Saudi Arabia Renewable Energy Investment Forum. "We are seeking for the kingdom, in the medium

term, to become a nation that develops, manufactures and exports the advanced technologies of renewable energy production," he said. "This is really transformational," he said, suggesting that the changes coming to

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia wants 10 percent of its electricity the kingdom's energy sector will be as significant as the discovery of oil in the 1930s. "You're really talking about a significant socio-economic transition that's going to take place" over the next decade or two.

Falih said the energy sector is being completely

restructured to include an autonomous board of regulators, and with privatized generation capacity. He formally opened bids on the first 300-megawatt solar plant under the renewables plan. The government has shortlisted 51 firms, most of them from abroad, for bidding on that plant and a 400-megawatt wind farm.

Another wind project will be launched in the fourth quarter of this year, followed by more solar projects, he told hundreds of delegates. Government estimates say Saudi peak energy demand is expected to exceed 120 gigawatts by 2032. Falih told the forum that nuclear power will also be part of the kingdom's energy mix. But details are still being worked out, he told AFP on the sidelines of the two-day

meeting. "We haven't designed the program yet. We are working on various options, looking at regulations, establishing the regulatory framework first and making sure we have all the steps before we announce the capacities and the locations," he said. "But it will be coming in due course." — AFP

ANTI-CORRUPTION AUTHORITY HOLDS SEMINAR

KUWAIT: Kuwait's Public Anti-Corruption Authority organized a seminar at its headquarters in Shamiya Sunday evening to discuss Kuwait's position in the international scene and the application of anti-corruption legislations.

"Despite the difficulties faced by the authority and the difficulties encountered in the reconstruction and the development of the new law, we have undertaken to carry out its technical duties related to receiving and processing financial disclosure data and receiving reports and complaints relating to corruption," explained Abdulrahman Al-Namash, head of the authority.

The anti-corruption body is tasked with investigating incidents of corruption, wasting of public funds and other forms of fiscal malfeasance in the public sector. The authority, created by Law No. 2/2016 is authorized to investigate financial and asset disclosures and help improve transparency in Kuwait's economy.

The authority has already referred several government officials to the public prosecution for a variety of alleged offenses including failure to disclose income and assets as well and questions over contracts and tenders. Acting Secretary General Dr Mohammed Abdul Rahman Bouzaber said that the authority will adopt the recommendations of the symposium and its sponsorship, pointing out that it does not face any obstacles at the technical level at the present time.

Bouzaber added that the authority received 4,081 financial approvals so far, for about 50 percent of the total number of subjects under the authority of about 8,000. He pointed out that the authority received 36 corruption reports to be considered. He added that whistle blowers providing real evidence and documents would be taken seriously and the information kept confidential.

The seminar was held under the patronage of Sheikh Nasser Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, Minister of the Amiri Diwan, who also attended the seminar along with several lawmakers, members of the Kuwait Transparency Society and the Society for the Protection of Public Money.

CABINET MULLS SETTING UP SHAREHOLDING COMPANY TO RUN JABER AL-AHMAD HOSPITAL

KUWAIT: The Cabinet discussed a recommendation made by Kuwait Investment Authority to establish a closed shareholding company to run Jaber Al-Ahmad Hospital, provided that it would be turned into a public joint company in the future through a public auction. During its weekly meeting yesterday, the Cabinet also asked the Ministry of Health to consider suggestions and recommendations made by the human and social development committee of the Supreme Council for Planning and Development to improve health services in the country.

Meanwhile, the Cabinet has entrusted the Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research (KISR) with creating a national committee for research, scientific, technology and innovation. KISR will do the fresh mission with all relevant regulatory and legal aspects, in collaboration with other concerned state agencies, Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah said in a press statement following the meeting that took place at Bayan Palace. KISR will have to send a report to the Cabinet in this regard within a month's time, added Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah, who doubles as Acting Minister of Information.

Furthermore, the Cabinet tasked the Ministry of Public Works to take required measures to speed up the implementation of beach development projects in the context of a relevant tourism development drive.

At the onset of the meeting, His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, who chaired the meeting, briefed the ministers on the outcomes of the recent visit by Sudanese President Omar Al-Bashir to Kuwait. First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah then elaborated on the outcomes of his participation in the 9th session of the joint Kuwaiti-Bahraini committee held in Kuwait on Sunday. ment regret at the recent bombing targeting a bus that carried evacuees traveling from the Syrian towns of Al-Foua'a and Kefraya to government-controlled areas. NO VISA FOR KUWAITIS TO VISIT RUSSIAN FAR EAST

GORKI: Kuwait is one of 18 countries whose citizens can now visit the Russian Far East without visas, the Russian media reported yesterday. "I have recently approved the list of countries, whose nationals can take advantage of the preferential regime," Russia's Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev said yesterday. "Businessmen and tourists will not need to undergo the traditional procedure of Russian visas receipt. It will be enough for foreigners to enter their data on a special website in the Internet."

"We are proactively forming the modern infrastructure and creating special regimes in the Far East; the law on visits to the Vladivostok free port was approved in March," Medvedev said. Cancellation of visa procedures for tourists and businessmen "will promote growth of investment and tourist attractiveness of the Far East," the prime minister said. The region will earn more money from tourist traffic growth, he added.

Eighteen countries from various regions selected by the reciprocity principle were included into the list, Medvedev said. "This is not because these states are situated at a closer or longer distance - we are appropriately introducing bilateral agreements on visa-free travel for those ready to use such an approach for us," he added. According to the official site of the Russian Cabinet, the list of 18 countries comprises - in addition to Kuwait - Algeria, Bahrain, Brunei, India, Iran, Qatar, China, North Korea, Morocco, Mexico, UAE, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Tunisia, Turkey and Japan. — Russian News Agency

MEETING TO DISCUSS POSSIBILITY TO MERGE PREMIER'S GRILLING MOTIONS

KUWAIT: There are attempts to gather MPs who filed two separate grilling motions against His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah for a meeting to discuss the possibility of merging both motions in a bid to 'unify efforts' in that regard. The meeting would bring together 26 lawmakers who comprise the opposition in the National Assembly, according to parliamentary sources.

The lawmakers believe the merging process will be easy because the grilling motion filed by MPs Mohammad Al-Mutair, Waleed Al-Tabtabaie and Marzouq Al-Khalifa includes five key factors, while the second one filed by MPs Riyadh Al-Adasani and Shuaib Al-Mowaizri includes only one factor concerning the government's performance, which is similar to the fourth factor in the first motion. "Therefore, the second motion can be included as part of the first," the sources stressed.

The meeting would also discuss determining which three of the five MPs will discuss those factors during the debate, the sources said, pointing out that those who called for the meeting believe that Mutair and Mowaizri will likely withdraw while Marzouq Al-Khalifa insists on filing the grilling motion. The reason for that is because Khalifa feels he needs to make a 'strong showing' that helps him in upcoming elections in anticipation of a Constitutional Court ruling on May 3 that could result in a parliament dissolution, the sources speculated. MPs who filed the interpellations reportedly seek to file a no-cooperation motion against the premier, and there is growing doubts within the 26 opposition lawmakers regarding whether they could secure ten signatures necessary to file said motion after the grilling's debate. "They believe therefore that merging the two motions will ensure having at least ten MPs sign the no-cooperation motion, thus achieving more political success for those who filed the grilling," the sources added.

Off course

The National Democratic Alliance (NDA) believes that

In a statement released to the press yesterday, NDA also urged anybody had solid documented proof and evidence of any forgery cases to report to the public prosecution so that those involved could be held legally accountable by court, be them senior officials or beneficiaries themselves.

Road projects

The Ministry of Public Works' (MPW) planning committee discussed the methodology to be used in qualifying companies for new tenders yet to be offered for bidding, said informed sources.

The sources also expected MPW to withdraw two road projects from a company because it failed to execute according to schedule. "The company is trying hard to avoid the withdrawal by accelerating its work pace," stressed the sources, noting that a special committee will be formed, in case of withdrawal, to run an inventory of the completed work so far and offer new tenders through the Central Tenders Committee (CTC) to complete the remaining works.

TRIO ARRESTED FOR Trading in Banned Sexual Enhancers

KUWAIT: Residency detectives managed to arrest a gang including three expats for trading with banned sexual enhancers. Case papers indicate that detectives were tipped off about an Arab man selling the enhancers in Sabah Al-Salem. He was later on arrested with possession of some of the merchandise he sold, the Interior Ministry's relations and security media department said in a statement. The suspect led detectives to his source; another expat, who was arrested in Farwaniya with possession of another quantity. The second suspect also led detectives to his supplier; a third expat living in Jleeb Al-Shuyoukh who was also arrested with possession of a large quantity and admitted of distributing the merchandise through various distributors in several areas. A case was filed and further investigations are in progress.

Sorcery

An Asian man was arrested for sorcery, said security sources, noting that several reports were made about the suspect's activities. Some of the complainants told police that their maids were seeking the suspect's help to 'bewitch' their sponsors and have them increase their salaries, stop punishing them for mistakes and make them loved by all family members. The source added that the suspect's house was placed under close surveillance before it was raided, and he was arrested red-handed while serving an undercover agent.

Crackdown

Mubarakiya and the Seafront food control inspectors carried out several inspection campaigns on restaurants and stores in Qibla, Mubarakiya, Sharq and Benaid Al-Gar. The crackdowns resulted in confiscating and destroying 283 kilograms of fish and filing 14 citations.

SIX MEASURES TO HELP ADDRESS DEMOGRAPHIC IMBALANCE

KUWAIT: A supreme government committee entrusted with studying Kuwait's demographic imbalance is about to put six new measures in practice in a bid to resolve the problem. According to correspondences issued from the office of Minister of Social Affairs and Labor and Minister of State for Economic Affairs Hind Al-Sabeeh, the measures include reducing the number of domestic helpers' visas that a citizens is entitled to issue by 40 or 50 percent, reducing the number of laborers that security companies contracted with the government are allowed to hire by 25 percent while making up for the reduction by rely-

ing more on modern technology, and limiting the stay of expat laborers working in some professions in Kuwait, likely to a maximum of 10 or 20 years after which a worker would be mandated to leave the country for good. The measures also include reducing the number of visas issued per person in a single year, working on passing a new legislation to increase the residency violation fees by 100 percent, and passing a legislation to penalize any person found guilty of helping or encouraging absconders. These measures are still under studying and there is currently no date for when - or if - they would be enforced. — Al-Qabas

'uwait's rank on the corruption perceptions index for 2016 according to Transparency International dropped by 20 positions, as Kuwait ranks 75th in 2016 compared to 55th in 2015. Such dangerous information go by unnoticed, since it seems that there is no value for any indicator in Kuwait except for the oil price indicator.

The 75th place is considered a new record for the government in this field, as Kuwait never reached such a low rank on the corruption perceptions index since 2003. If our government continues working with the same bad system and failed method, then Kuwait will soon find itself competing with other underdeveloped countries in Asia and Africa for last place.

It is natural for the government to get this rank, and everybody in Kuwait feels that they are surrounded with corruption wherever they go, whether in state departments or projects. Last year was haunted by the 2013 parliament, which we have miraculously escaped from. That parliament contributed to the absence of true national achievements, then certain influential people took control by marginalizing State Audit Bureau reports and crippling the work of the Public Anti-Corruption Authority.

Did the government have a discussion over this low rank and find out the reasons behind it? Was a report about this 'great achievement' presented to the Cabinet? Did the National Assembly hold a special session to discuss this situations that harmed Kuwait's reputation around the world? The answer will be 'no' of course, because this is not the true interest of state officials as long as their posts are protected and their interests are unaffected, except for a few.

Are we to remind you that Kuwait's rank at the end of 2016 dropped in more than eight categories? They are best countries in business practices, international competition report, ease of business activities, prosperity indicator, best and worst destinations around the world for expats, health and education indicators, press freedom and international peace index.

The country is filled with countless government agencies and new authorities. Conferences are held every week, trips made around the world, television interviews are taking place, ideologists and their supporters are speaking all day long in the media and on social networks, the government meets every week and the parliament holds meetings regularly. In the end, this is the rank that we receive from an international organization. Do you also agree with me that the only successful authority in Kuwait is the 'Corruption Protection Authority'?!

'ERA OF STRATEGIC PATIENCE IS OVER,' N KOREA WARNED

US VICE PRESIDENT VISITS HIGHLY FORTIFIED DMZ

SEOUL: US Vice President Mike Pence put North Korea on notice yesterday neither the United States nor South Korea would tolerate further missile and nuclear tests, with US attacks in Syria and Afghanistan showing its resolve. Pence and South Korean acting president Hwang Kyo-ahn, speaking a day after a failed missile test by the North and two days after a huge display of missiles in Pyongyang, also said they would strengthen anti-North Korea defenses by moving ahead with the early deployment of the THAAD missile defense system.

Pence is on the first stop of a four-nation Asia tour intended to show America's allies, and remind its adversaries, that the administration of President Donald Trump was not turning its back on the increasingly volatile region. In a joint appearance, Pence said North Korea should mind the actions and intent of the president. "Just in the past two weeks, the world witnessed the strength and resolve of our new president in actions taken in Syria and Afghanistan. North Korea would do well not to test his resolve or the strength of the armed forces of the United States in this region."

The US Navy this month struck a Syrian airfield with 59 Tomahawk missiles. On Thursday, the US military said it had dropped "the mother of all bombs," the largest non-nuclear device it has ever unleashed in combat, on a network of caves and tunnels used by Islamic State in eastern Afghanistan. On a visit to the border between North and South Korea earlier in the day, Pence reiterated that the US "era of strategic patience" with Pyongyang was over. Pence, whose father served in the 1950-53 Korean War, said the United States would stand by its "iron-clad alliance" with South Korea and was seeking peace through strength.

"All options are on the table to achieve the objectives and ensure the stability of the people of this country," he told reporters as tinny propaganda music floated across from the North Korean side of the so-called demilitarized zone (DMZ). "There was a period of strategic patience but the era of strategic patience is over." The United States, its allies and China are working together on a range of responses to North Korea's latest failed ballistic missile test, Trump's national security adviser said on Sunday, citing what he called an international consensus to act. But Pence and Hwang said they were troubled by retaliatory moves by China against the deployment of in South Korea of a US anti-missile system known as the Terminal High Altitude Area Defense (THAAD). "The United States is troubled by China's economic retaliation against South Korea for taking appropriate steps to defend itself," Pence said. South Korea, which accuses China or discriminating against some South Korean companies working in China, and the United States say the sole purpose of THAAD is to guard against North Korean missiles. China says its powerful radar can penetrate its territory and undermine its security. Trump's national security adviser, H.R. McMaster, indicated on Sunday that Trump was not considering military action against North Korea for now, even as a nuclear-powered aircraft carrier strike group was heading for the region.

"It's time for us to undertake all actions we can, short of a military option, to try to resolve this peacefully," he said on ABC's "This Week' program. "We are working together with our allies and partners and with the Chinese leadership to develop a range of options. The Trump administration is focusing its strategy on tougher economic sanctions, possibly including an oil embargo, a global ban on its airline, intercepting cargo ships and punishing Chinese banks doing business with Pyongyang, Reuters reported last week, citing US officials. While Trump has employed tough rhetoric in response to North Korea's recent missile tests, the president's options appear limited in dealing with a challenge that has vexed his Oval Office predecessors. Most options fall into four categories: economic sanctions, covert action, diplomatic negotiations and military force. Pence landed in South Korea hours after the North's failed missile launch. His visit came a day after North Korea held a military parade in its capital, Pyongyang, marking the 105th anniversary of the birth of founding father Kim II Sung. What appeared to be new long-range ballistic missiles were on display in the parade.

'See what happens'

Tensions have risen as Trump takes a hard rhetorical line with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, who has rebuffed admonitions from China and proceeded with nuclear and missile programs seen by Washington as a direct threat. Trump acknowledged on Sunday that the softer line he had taken on China's management of its currency was linked to its help on North Korea. Pence said Trump was hopeful China "will take actions needed to bring about change in policy" in North Korea. "But as the president has made very clear, either China will deal with this problem or the United States and our allies will," he said.

China has spoken out against the North's weapons tests and has supported UN sanctions. It has repeatedly called for talks while appearing increasingly frustrated with the North. China banned imports of North Korean coal on Feb. 26, cutting off its most important export. China's customs department issued an order on April 7 telling traders to return North Korean coal cargoes, trading sources said.

Pyongyang has conducted several missile and nuclear tests in defiance of UN sanctions, and regularly threatens to destroy South Korea and the United States. North and South Korea are technically still at war because their 1950-1953 conflict ended in a truce, not a treaty. The North has said it has developed and would launch a missile that can strike the US mainland, but officials and experts believe it is some time away from mastering the necessary technology, including miniaturizing a nuclear warhead.— Reuters

IRAQ'S FORCES FIGHT DOOR-TO-DOOR AS BATTLES ENTERS SEVENTH MONTH

MOSUL: Iraqi forces gained fresh ground in door-to-door fighting in the Old City of Mosul, a military spokesman said yesterday, as the USbacked offensive to capture Islamic State's de facto capital in Iraq entered its seventh month. A Reuters correspondent saw thick smoke billowing over the Old City, near the Grand Al-Nuri Mosque, from where Islamic State leader Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi declared a "caliphate" spanning parts of Iraq and Syria.

Heavy exchanges of gunfire and mortar rounds could be heard from the neighborhoods facing the old city across the Tigris river that bisects Mosul into a western and eastern sides. The war between Islamic State militants and Iraqi forces is taking a heavy toll on several hundred thousand civilians trapped inside the city, with severely malnourished babies reaching hospitals in government-held areas. Iraqi Federal Police forces "are engaged in difficult, house-to-house clashes with Daesh fighters inside the Old City", a media officer from these units said. Drones are extensively being used to locate and direct air strikes on the militants who are dug in the middle of civilians, he said.

Troops have had the famous centuries-old Al-Nuri Mosque leaning minaret in their sights since last month, as capturing it would mark a symbolic victory over the insurgents. A police spokesman said the troops were closing in on the mosque without indicating the remaining distance. Their progress has been slow as about 400,000 civilians, or a quarter of Mosul's pre-war population, are trapped in neighborhoods still under control of the militants. More

300,000 have fled fighting since the offensive operation started on Oct 17, with strong air and ground support from a US-led coalition. Mosul, the largest city in northern Iraq, was captured by the ultra-hardline Sunni Muslim fighters in mid 2014. Government forces,

including army, police and elite counter terrorism units have taken back most of it, including the half that lies east of the Tigris river. The militants are now surrounded in the northwestern quarter including the historic Old City, using booby traps, sniper and mortar fire against the assailants. Police on Sunday reported a toxic gas attack on its troops that caused no deaths. It also said the militants were increasingly using suicide motorbikes attacks. The narrow alleyways restricts the use of suicide cars by the militants and tanks, armored personnel carriers and Humvees by the government forces.

The United Nations said last month that 12 people, including women and children, had been treated for possible exposure to chemical weapons agents in Mosul. But Iraq's UN ambassador, Mohamed Ali Alhakim, said days later there was no evidence for that. The fighting has killed several thousands among civilians and fighters on both sides, according to aid organizations. Residents who have managed to escape from the Old City have said there is almost nothing to eat but flour mixed with water and boiled wheat grain. What little food remains is too expensive for most residents to afford, or kept for Islamic State members and their supporters. — Reuters

KILLER POSTS GRUESOME MURDER ON FACEBOOK

OHIO: Cleveland police urged a suspect who they said posted video of himself on Facebook killing an elderly man on Sunday to turn himself in to authorities. Officials in the Ohio city said they were looking for Steve Stephens in connection with the one confirmed killing but had found no evidence to support what police said was a claim he made in the video of having killed more than a dozen other people. "Everybody is out there looking for Steve," Calvin Williams, the Cleveland police chief, told a news conference, where he joined Mayor Frank Jackson in asking Stephens to turn himself in. They said Stephens might be driving a white or cream-colored Ford Fusion, and that he was armed and dangerous.

"We want this to end with as much peace as we can bring to this right now," Williams said, adding police knew of no other victims. Late Sunday night Cleveland police issued a aggravated murder warrant for Stephens, and warned that he could have crossed state lines into Pennsylvania, New York, Indiana or Michigan, Police said Stephens used Facebook to post video of him killing the man, who police identified as 74-year-old Robert Godwin Sr. Stephens is not believed to have known Godwin, police said. The world's largest online social network, used by more than 1.2 billion people every day, condemned the accused killer's action. "This is a horrific crime and we do not allow this kind of content on Facebook," said a spokesperson for the company. "We work hard to keep a safe environment on Facebook, and are in touch with law enforcement in emergencies when there are direct threats to physical safety." It is not the first time a serious crime has been posted on Facebook. — Reuters

Suspected acid attack in a London nightclub

LONDON: Twelve people were injured when a corrosive substance was sprayed inside a packed London nightclub, police and fire services said, amid a sharp rise in acid attacks in Britain's capital. Two of the victims, both men in their twenties, are in a "serious but stable condition" and 10 others suffered "minor injuries", police said in a statement. A London Fire Brigade spokesman said an "unknown corrosive substance" was thrown in Mangle, a club in east London, in the early hours of Monday. It was identified as "an acidic substance" from testing, he said, adding that there were around 600 people in the club at the time. Police said the incident was not believed to be terrorism or gang related but the result of a dispute between two groups of people in the club. They said the fight led to "a noxious substance being sprayed by a male suspect directly at Victims 1 and 2"-the two men with the more serious injuries. "Other people inside the venue suffered the effects of the substance," the statement said, adding that no arrests have been made and appealing for witnesses.

Tibetan monk sets himself on fire in western China

BEIJING: A Tibetan Buddhist monk set himself on fire in western China in an apparent protest against Beijing's rule, a monitoring group and a US government-backed radio station said. The monk set himself ablaze in a public square on Saturday morning in Kardze, also known as Ganzi, in western Sichuan province, according to Radio Free Asia and Free Tibet, an advocacy group based in Britain. The unidentified monk was taken away after the fire was extinguished by security forces, reports said. It was unclear if he survived. A man who answered the phone at the local police station yesterday said he was unaware of the case and "not clear" about the situation. The government for Garze Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture, which includes the town of Kardze, referred questions to police. A YouTube video purported to be of the incident showed two men spraying fire extinguishers on what appeared to be a body at the edge of a busy street as a crowd gathered.

400 evacuated after a deadly dump collapse

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka has moved over 400 families to temporary shelters after tons of rotting garbage collapsed onto a slum, killing at least 28 people. Some 145 homes were destroyed when the 300-foot rubbish mountain came crashing down on Friday afternoon at Kolonnawa on the northeastern edge of Colombo. Police say many more buildings were damaged and could collapse at any time. Hundreds of soldiers have kept up the search for survivors amid reports that seven people from four families were still missing after the disaster, which followed heavy rain the previous day and a fire hours earlier. It came as the country celebrated the traditional new year and followed a warning to parliament that the 23 million tons of rotting garbage posed a serious health hazard. "We are keeping up the search but we are not very hopeful of finding anyone alive in these conditions," military spokesman Roshan Seneviratne said yesterday. The discovery of a man's body and a dismembered limb during the search Monday had pushed the death toll to 28, Seneviratne added.

Over 120 Syrians killed in bus bombing during swap

BEIRUT: Mothers Noha, a Shiite, and Samira, a Sunni, were besieged for nearly two years on each side of Syria's civil war. At the weekend they finally escaped the suffocating blockades under an evacuation agreement - but their ordeal was not over. As they waited at two transit points miles apart outside Aleppo, a bomb attack hit Noha's bus convoy, killing more than 120 people including dozens of children. After ambulances rushed off the

45, asking not to be identified by her last name. Noha left Al-Foua, one of two Shiite villages besieged by Syrian insurgents in Idlib province with her two youngest children and 5,000 other people under a deal between the Syrian government and armed opposition.

In exchange, 2,000 Sunni residents and rebel fighters from the governmentbesieged town of Madaya near Damascus - Samira's hometown - were given safe Syria's main urban centers in the west of the country, and engenders demographic change because most of the opposition, and Syria's population, are Sunni. But backed militarily by Russia and Shiite regional allies, Assad, a member of Syria's Alawite minority, has negotiated the deals from a position of strength. "There was little choice. We had to leave, we were scared," said Samira, 55, who was travelling with her five adult sons. She had

We hope to go back one day, but I don't expect we will," said Noha,

Nowhere to live

With nothing left and no place to stay in Idlib other than camps, Samira said she would try to migrate, joining the 5 million Syrian refugees who have left since the war broke out in 2011. More than 6 million are internally displaced. "I don't want to be in Idlib, we know no one there. Also you don't know when or where the jets might bomb," she said, referring to the heavy bombardment by Russian and Syrian warplanes of rebel-held areas in Idlib - including a recent alleged poison gas attack. "The plan is to try to get to Turkey, to leave Syria for good." Noha was also heading into the unknown. "I don't know where we'll live, whether they (authorities) have anything set up. At the very least, we just want to be safe. The children jump at night from the sound of rockets. We just want security, wherever they take us," she said.

Her adult son and daughter had stayed in Al-Foua but were hoping to leave in the next stage of the evacuation deal. Noha's husband had been killed, but she did not say how. Both women said they would never have left their hometowns but for the strangling sieges, which caused severe food and medicine shortages, and the gradual change of control in each area. Government forces moved into Madaya on Friday. Rebels are also due to leave nearby Zabadani as part of the deal. In al-Foua and Kefraya, hundreds of pro-government fighters were evacuated, and the agreement will pave the way for insurgents to take over.

Russia, Iran and Lebanese Hezbollah have helped Assad gain the upper hand against rebels in the west of the country in the last 18 months and he now controls all of Syria's most populous cities there, although insurgents have made gains in some areas. But with the war that has killed hundreds of thousands far from over, those displaced in swap deals see return a long way off. "People have built their houses and worked their whole lives setting themselves up, and now they've left, with nothing, zero," Noha said. —Reuters

WARTIME CRISIS THREATENS EDUCATION OF YEMENI KIDS

DUBAI: Two years of war may deprive a generation of Yemeni children of an education, the UN warned this month, putting them at greater risk of being married off or recruited as child soldiers for a conflict which has killed at least 10,000 people. Months of unpaid salaries have affected over threequarters of the impoverished country's teachers, meaning up to 4.5 million children may not finish the school year, UNICEF Representative in Yemen Mertixell Relano told a press conference in the capital Sanaa.

"At the moment we have more than 166,000 teachers in the country that have not received a salary since October last year. This is more or less 73 percent of the total number of teachers in the country," Relano said. "Those children that are not in school, they are at risk of being recruited (for military service), or the

girls might be at risk of being married earlier," she added. The crisis largely began last year when the internationally-recognized government shifted Yemen's central bank out of Sanaa, which is controlled by the armed Houthi movement with which it is at war.

The government says the Houthis looted the bank and that it is trying to make all payments despite what it calls Houthi obstruction of the transfers charges the group denies. Seven months of salaries remain in arrears, public sector employees in Houthi-controlled northern lands say, making travel to work and paying for basic necessities more difficult. "Money is the backbone of life," lamented Hoda Al Khoulani, a teacher at a children's school in Sanaa. Without it, I don't think anyone can live and there will be suffering. We're almost begging."—Reuters

Mexico asks Guatemala to extradite former governor

GUATEMALA CITY: Mexico has asked Guatemala to extradite a fugitive former governor suspected of embezzling hundreds of millions of dollars, officials said vesterday. Javier Duarte, of Veracruz state, was arrested around 8:00 pm at a luxury hotel in the tourist resort town of Panajachel on Saturday, Guatemalan police said. Mexico filed its extradition request later that night. "Now there is a 60-day period in which bilateral extradition issues are looked at. Then the judge will determine if the necessary conditions are met and that he should be extradited," Mexico's top prosecutor Omar Garcia said at a briefing at Mexico's embassy in Guatemala City. Duarte had been staying at the four-star hotel for at least two days, where he paid with cash, used a false name and was accompanied by his wife, deputy director of Guatemala's police Stu Velasco told Milenio television.

Kyrgyzstan jails opposition members over alleged plot

BISHKEK: Three members of Kyrgyzstan's opposition were jailed for between 12 and 20 years yesterday over an alleged coup plot captured on a disputed audio recording aired on the internet. The sentences are likely to add to fears of a crackdown ahead of November elections, following anti-government protests. A Bishkek court jailed activist Ernest Karybekov for 20 years, and former MP Kubanychbek Kadyrov and ex-regional governor Bektur Asanov for 12 years each for their roles in the purported plot. A fourth defendant, ex-foreign minister Dastan Sarygulov, was given a suspended four-year sentence at the closed-doors hearing. The four men were arrested last year shortly after the recording appeared to show Asanov and Kadyrov plotting to seize power in the fragile republic of six million. The opposition figures claimed the recording was heavily edited.

Villagers seize dozens of Vietnam policemen

HANOI: Villagers in Vietnam's capital yesterday were holding more than 30 people, most of them policemen, over a land dispute in a rare defiance of the communist government. The standoff began over the weekend in My Duc, a district of Hanoi, when police clashed with villagers who allege their land was illegally seized for sale by a militaryrun telecommunications firm. Some villagers were arrested. Social activist La Viet Dung said yesterday that villagers were still holding more than 30 people, including over 20 Hanoi riot police, as well as local policemen and officials. He said authorities asked the villagers to release them but they refused to do so. The Online newspaper Vnexpress quoted a villager identified only as Loan as saying, "The policemen have been given sufficient food and drinks by us and are being treated politely."

UNITED AIRLINES REMOVES A COUPLE AMID OUTRAGE

NEW YORK: An engaged couple were removed from a seating which they did not purchase and they would not United Airlines flight to Costa Rica, as the airline remained under scrutiny following outrage caused by a video last week of a passenger being forcibly removed from a flight. According to the couple, who said they were en route to get married, a federal marshal had escorted them from the plane before take-off from Houston, Texas, but United denied this on Sunday, saying in a statement that neither a marshal nor other authorities were involved.

The couple "repeatedly attempted to sit in upgraded

follow crew instructions to return to their assigned seats," United said in a statement, adding "They were asked to leave the plane by our staff and complied." The statement from a United spokeswoman said the airline offered the couple a discounted hotel rate for the night, and rebooked them on a Sunday morning flight. But Michael Hohl and his fiancee, Amber Maxwell, told KHOU they tried to pay for upgraded seating and were denied, after finding another passenger sleeping across their seats when they were the last to board.

After moving within the economy cabin a few rows up, flight crew denied their request to pay a supplement for the seats, which United sells as "economy plus", and told them to move back to their original seats, Hohl said. "We thought not a big deal, it's not like we are trying to jump up into a first-class seat," Hohl told KHOU. "We were simply in an economy row a few rows above our economy seat." The airline suffered a public relations disaster after a video emerged a week ago showing security officers dragging a bloodied passenger off an overbooked United Express flight in Chicago. —Reuters

ABSENCE, FITNESS, ATMOSPHERE - NEW WAYS TO TRACK SCHOOLS

WASHINGTON: How often do students miss school? Are they ready for college? Are they physically fit? Is their school a welcoming place? States are beginning to outline new ways to evaluate their schools, rather than relying just on traditional measures such as test scores. The plans are required under a new federal education law, the Every Student Succeeds Act, which takes effect in the coming school year. Under the new law, states are focusing more on academic growth, meaning not just whether students have achieved a certain academic level in reading and math, but whether they have improved over time.

Mike Petrilli, president of the Thomas B Fordham Institute, said that's a big change from the No Child Left Behind Act, the previous version of the education law. "Schools and educators should feel good about that; that will be a fairer way to measure school quality," he said. But while most experts praised the flexibility and innovation offered by the new law, some think that in the absence of federal guidelines some states may overlook groups of students who need additional support, such as minorities, students with disabilities and English-language learners. ly this year to rescind key federal accountability guidelines passed by the Obama administration to help states implement the new law. So far, nine states and the District of Columbia have submitted their accountability plans to the Education Department for review, and seven states are completing their blueprints.

Flexibility in education

The remaining states will submit their plans in September. Education Secretary Betsy DeVos will decide whether to accept or reject them. She has said her goal is state and local flexibility in education and indicated that she might use the process to advance school choice. When evaluating school quality, states are experimenting with new indicators. Almost all of the first-round states have adopted chronic absenteeism, or how many students miss more than 10 percent of the school year, as a key metric. Connecticut and Delaware, among others, also will be tracking college readiness, or whether high school students are taking advanced classes and how successful they are on college admission tests like the SAT.

Tennessee wants to give every public school in the

state a grade from A to F, which state Education Commissioner Candice McQueen says would give parents better information about schools. The grade will take into account such things as how well English language learners are doing and whether disabled students are being served. The schools will also be graded on chronic absenteeism rates, and if students are ready for college or the military and whether traditionally underserved students are performing well. Graduation rates also will count. Nevada outlined a system that focuses on student growth measures, including test scores, English language proficiency, and graduation rates. Massachusetts will be paying attention to academic results in ninth grade.

In New Mexico, the state will begin tracking the need for additional tutoring in college and linking those back to high schools where the students studied. The state also will look at how students do in science in ranking schools. Some states are getting creative. Vermont and Connecticut want to make physical fitness another sign of school quality, while Connecticut also believes access to arts education should be another measure. Illinois wants to conduct "climate surveys" asking whether children feel they are in a safe and welcoming environment. "There is a lot more than just tests that matter for student success," said Natasha Ushomirsky with the Education Trust. "Tests are important and looking at progress is important, but states are getting a better picture of how schools are serving students." Another common thread that has emerged from the first round: States are doing a better job of involving parents, teachers and community activists in the process. "They've been very proactive to engage anybody who has an interest in the plans," said Kirsten Carr with the Council of Chief State School Officers.

But Marc Magee, CEO of 50Can, an education nonprofit, expressed concern that "if everybody doesn't hold up their end of the bargain, we could go back to that era where certain populations of students become invisible inside schools even if they are struggling mightily and not getting the opportunity that they deserve." And Lindsey Tepe, senior education policy analyst at New America, said there is so much variation in how states want to evaluate their schools that national comparisons could be difficult. "Without the guidance, there isn't really a recipe to follow," said Tepe. — AP

ARKANSAS EXECUTION DRUGS

LITTLE ROCK: A federal judge has granted stays to eight Arkansas inmates who were scheduled to be executed before the end of the month, when the state's supply of an execution drug expires. In her order Saturday, which the state promptly appealed, US District Judge Kristine Baker said the inmates have the right to challenge the state's method of execution in an attempt to show it "creates a demonstrated risk of severe pain" and that she thinks they have a significant chance to succeed.

Arkansas, which hasn't put anyone to death since 2005 due to legal challenges and difficulty getting execution drugs, plans to use three drugs to kill the inmates, including two that are typically used in surgery and one that benefits cardiac patients. The manufacturers of the three drugs object to their use in executions. Here is a look at the drugs:

Midazolam

Midazolam is the key drug in the procedure and one that Arkansas hasn't yet used in an execution. It would be the first of the three drugs administered and would be used to sedate the inmate. Because the state's supply reaches its expiration date April 30, Arkansas scheduled eight executions before then. At normal adult doses of around 4 mg, midazolam can slow or stop breathing to the point that medical literature advises doctors to monitor patients closely. With a 500 mg dose listed in the state's execution protocol, Arkansas expects that the inmates will not be aware they are dying. In federal court testimony over the past week, doctors differed on whether midazolam is an appropriate execution drug, though the US Supreme Court has ruled that it is. In her ruling, Baker said that, regardless of the difference, Arkansas' execution protocol doesn't outline what would happen if the inmate were to remain

tightness or muscle pain, vecuronium is used to prevent muscles from moving so they don't interfere with surgeons. After receiving the drug, patients must be on a ventilator or they will suffocate because their diaphragm cannot move. One doctor testified that being given vecuronium bromide without sedation and ventilation would be equivalent to being held underwater. The typical dose is up to .1 mg/kg intravenously, or 8.5 mg for the typical inmate set to die this month.

Under Arkansas' protocol, executioners would administer 100 mg, or more than 11 times the typical dose, five minutes after the midazolam is administered and once the inmate is unconscious. Medical supply company McKesson says Arkansas obtained its vecuronium bromide under false pretenses and that the state will not return it, even though the company has refunded Arkansas' money. A state judge Friday directed Arkansas to not use its current supply of vecuronium bromide pending a hearing Tuesday on whether it was obtained properly, though McKesson said Saturday that, with Baker's stays, it no longer needs the hearing.

Potassium chloride

Potassium is essential for maintaining a proper heart rhythm, and levels that are too high or too low can cause heart trouble. Medical experts who testified before Baker said that the final drug, potassium chloride, causes considerable pain when injected and is typically diluted when given to patients. A typical dose is 20 milliequivalents delivered over several hours. Arkansas plans to use 240 mEq immediately after the inmate is injected with vecuronium bromide. The director of the Arkansas Department of Correction, Wendy Kelley, testified this week that Arkansas was not charged for its current supply of potassium chloride. She said the supplier wished to remain anonymous and did not want to generate a bill of sale to decrease the risk of being identified. According to Baker's order, Kelley said Arkansas did not obtain its execution drugs directly from any manufacturer, though she wouldn't say who provided the drugs, citing a state law that allows her department to keep most execution information secret. —AP

WILL FREE COLLEGE OFFER CATCH FIRE? - NY DETAILS RAISE DOUBTS

FIRST-IN-THE-NATION FREE TUITION PROGRAM

ALBANY: Will New York's first-in-the-nation free tuition program for middle-class college students spread to other states? That's the hope of proponents such as Bernie Sanders and Hillary Clinton, who made debt-free college a key talking point in their Democratic presidential campaigns. And that's the prediction of its main champion, Democratic New York Gov Andrew Cuomo, who called the plan a "model for the nation." But even as higher education experts applaud the concept of free tuition, they question finer points of New York's plan and whether it's a model that should be replicated elsewhere. New York's plan would cover in-state public college tuition for full-time students whose families earn \$125,000 or less, a benefit that could extend to 32,000 students a year. Some experts are concerned the plan would actually do little to help the neediest students, whose tuition is already covered by other aid. They also question the plan not addressing other college costs beyond tuition. And there has already been much debate about a restriction - added late in the negotiations - that recipients live and work in the state for the number of years they receive the benefit. If students move out of state, the money would be converted into a loan that must be repaid. "Students are not going to plan for future debt because they're going to think they don't have any," said Sara Goldrick-Rab, a Temple University expert on college affordability issues. "And then they'll get a job in another state and they're going to get smacked in the face literally by the state of New York for the bill."

dents by changing the narrative from broad free college tuition to a workforce development initiative. State University of New York Chancellor Nancy Zimpher says the controversy may be overblown, noting that about 85 percent of graduates from the state university system stay in New York after graduation anyway. "It's kind of tamps down the drama," she said. Even Sanders, who has long advocated addressing the nation's \$1.3 trillion student debt problem, acknowledged there are some aspects of New York's plan he disagrees with. But he gave Cuomo and New York lawmakers credit for being first to tackle it. "They have paved the way for other states to go forward, for the federal government to go forward to make public colleges and universities tuition free," the Vermont senator said in an interview with The Associated Press. "I see that as a tremendous achievement, and we look forward to other states following New York." Barmak Nassirian, director of federal relations and policy analysis for the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, agreed New York's program is a strong political move but questioned an execution that "borders on gimmicky." He was particularly critical of New York's "lastdollar" tuition-only setup, which would keep costs relatively low - an estimated \$163 million a year by paying the tuition only after awards from state and federal sources are applied. Students from families making \$50,000 or less wouldn't benefit because their tuition is already covered by other programs. "Unfortunately, the neediest are left with nothing but a feel-good message," Nassirian said. SUNY's Zimpher responded that the state's program extends possibilities to kids on the "edge" of other financial

assistance programs who might have never thought college was possible.

New York program

Other experts have noted that the New York program covers only tuition, with no additional



money for other college fees such as room and board and books, which can be substantial. Over the course of four years at a State University of New York college, tuition would make up only about \$26,000 of the total \$83,000 tab. Despite such uncertainties, Nassirian also gave credit to Cuomo, who has been mentioned as a possible 2020 presidential candidate, for giving the concept of free college new life. "The pressure now builds," he said, "for others in deep blue states to do something." The closest currently is Rhode Island, where Democratic Gov. Gina Raimondo is pushing to make two years of public college free for residents, regardless of income. Tennessee and Oregon already offer free in-state tuition at community colleges.

Students at the University of Albany, part of the state university system, say that while grateful for New York's plan, they are wary of its details. "I hope it works," said Nicole Pitt, a 21-year-old biology major. "But there's going to be a lot of fine print, something hidden that's going to come back and bite the person in the butt later." Cumorah Reed, a 19-year-old English major who also works at a pharmacy to pay for college, said her mother "lost her mind" with excitement when the proposal passed, only to learn the scholarship would only cover about a third of Reed's annual costs. "There's still \$12,000 for room and board. It's double the tuition," she said. "So that's ... fun." — AP

HOOD RIVER: In the auditorium of his old middle school just blocks from where he still lives, the congressman who is a lead author of the stalled House Republican health care bill was treated like the villain in a class play. LITTLE ROCK: Lawyers for the state of Arkansas faced fights on multiple legal fronts yesterday to begin a series of double executions before a key sedative used in lethal injections expires at the end of the month. Bruce Earl Ward and Don William Davis Jr had been scheduled to die yesterday night, the first of four double executions set by Gov Asa Hutchinson for an 11-day period. A federal judge issued stays for each of the inmates Saturday and a state court judge on Friday blocked prison officials from using a paralyzing drug until he could determine whether Arkansas obtained it properly.

Arkansas appealed in those cases and also hoped to dissolve a separate stay for Ward that had been issued by the Arkansas Supreme Court. In a victory for the state Sunday, a federal judge in western Arkansas denied a stay request by Davis. Even with the stays in place and questions remaining before a number of courts, executions are still possible. The US Supreme Court could be asked to tackle a number of questions before the end of the day and, depending on those answers, Ward could walk to the death chamber at Varner for a 7 pm execution.

"Immediate reversal is warranted," Arkansas' solicitor general, Lee Rudofsky, wrote Saturday to the 8th US Circuit Court of Appeals in St Louis. "(D)elaying Appellees' executions by even a few days - until Arkansas's supply of midazolam expires - will make it impossible for Arkansas to carry out Appellees' just and lawful sentences." At a federal court hearing last week, prison officials testified that they have no new source for the sedative, which is intended to mask the effects of drugs that will shut down the inmates' lungs and hearts.

The inmates say midazolam is unsuitable as an execution drug, saying it is not a painkiller and could subject them to a cruel and unusual punishment in violation of the US Constitution. If they aren't knocked out sufficiently, they would be able

to feel the pain of their lungs and hearts stopping, they say. In state court on Friday, Pulaski County Circuit Judge Wendell Griffen blocked the state from using its supply of vecuronium bromide after a distributor complained prison officials used false pretenses to obtain it. The drug prevents the diaphragm from moving, essentially suffocating the prisoners. — AP

FRONTRUNNERS LE PEN, MACRON HOLD RIVAL PARIS RALLIES

PARIS: The two frontrunners in the French presidential election, far-right leader Marine Le Pen and centrist Emmanuel Macron, were staging rival rallies in Paris yesterday, seeking to stay ahead of a fast-chasing pack just days before the vote. After weeks of twists and turns, the unpredictable race has narrowed dramatically, with surveys suggesting four candidates are in contention to win one of the top two spots in the April 23 vote and progress to the run-off election a fortnight later.

Scandal-hit conservative Francois Fillon and radical leftist Jean-Luc Melenchon are steaming up behind the two frontrunners, and with around one in three of the French electorate still undecided, candidates are scrapping for every vote. Le Pen and Macron, who have both scored as high as 25 percent in voter surveys, stood at 22 percent in the latest IPSOS poll, while Melenchon has surged to 20 percent and Fillon stands at 19.

Le Pen's own rally will be at the 6,000capacity Zenith concert hall in northeast Paris, with activists saying they plan protests outside the venue. A protest is also expected in the southern port of Marseille on Wednesday where Le Pen plans another large rally.

Canal cruise

Melenchon, 65, plans a quirky event that will see him board a barge in a northeast suburb of the French capital

for two years under his mentor Hollande. and float down a canal, making five stops along the way to meet and greet supporters. The voyage lasting more than five hours will end up at the Francois Mitterrand Library, a nod to the Socialist leader of the 1980s and early 1990s whom Melenchon references frequently in his stump speech as an icon of the left. The founder of "La France Insoumise" ("Unbowed France") plans another form of multiple appearances on Tuesday, where he will hold a rally in central Dijon while his hologram will speak for him in six other cities.

For his part Fillon, dogged by a fake jobs scandal that has seen him charged with abuse of public funds, is vowing to pull off a victory that will "surprise the microcosm" arrayed against him. He believes a small coterie of detractors mounted a campaign to smear him with the revelations that he put his wife Penelope on the public payroll with jobs that earned her hundreds of thousands of euros (dollars). Fillon, who led the race for weeks before the scandal broke in late January, spent Easter weekend wooing the Catholic and conservative vote. Conspicuous by his absence at the height of the scandal, the 63-year-old former prime minister has revved up his campaign appearances in the past week. — AFP

AT SEA: As usual, it started with a call on a satellite phone from Italian rescue officials in Rome. They were relaying a distress call they'd received from a migrant smuggling ship adrift somewhere off the coast of Libya. On board the Golfo Azurro, Guillermo Canardo was taking notes. "Two boats," he said. "One hundred people in each one." He paused, then asked the question that needed to be asked: "Are they (the migrants) still moving?" A fishing trawler-turnedexploration yacht-turned-rescue ship, the 30year-old Golfo Azurro is now operated by Proactiva Open Arms, a Spanish nonprofit dedicated to rescuing migrants before they are consumed by the unforgiving Mediterranean Sea.

and loaded sacks of lifejackets onto two orange rubber rescue boats. Fernando Garfella, skipper of the lead rescue boat, confirmed the coordinates and sped toward the target. After 15 minutes, a dot appeared on the horizon. Most migrants on the Mediterranean are now trying to reach Italy. Those numbers have dramatically increased since the European Union and Turkey signed an agreement last year that allowed Greece to send new asylum-seekers back to Turkey. In exchange, the EU agreed to speed up visas for Turkish citizens and donate 6 billion euros (\$6.4 billion) to help support the hundreds of thousands of refugees living on Turkish soil.

The 'vultures'

The rubber boat had left Libya thirteen hours earlier, traveling overnight and drifting since its small engine broke down. It was truly a makeshift craft - a rubber floater glued to a wooden base and held together by screws as large as a hand. There was no food or drinkable water left, and nowhere near enough fuel to reach Italian soil. The migrants were told that Europe was only five hours north of Libya. In fact, the closest point is Lampedusa, a tiny Italian island 160 nautical miles away, a boat journey that takes more than 32 hours in calm waters.

This group was lucky enough to reach an offshore oil well platform, guided by its burning flame, and rescue workers linked up with them near it. Once everyone had been transferred to the Golfo Azurro, a rescuer destroyed one of the smuggling boats' engines - the other was broken hours ago. That ensures that no "vultures" - the nickname for the local fishermen who scavenge the engines of smugglers' boats - can sell them back again to more traffickers. The rescuers' anger toward the smugglers is palpable, coming

The Libyan route

It works the SAR zone - the search-and-rescue zone - which starts 12 nautical miles from the Libyan coast and goes 12 miles deeper into the sea's unpredictable waters. According to UNHCR, an average of 14 people died in the Mediterranean every day in 2016, the highest number ever recorded. Canardo, the head of rescue operations on the Golfo Azurro, spoke that April day to Italy's Maritime Rescue Coordination Center, which passed along the troubled vessels' coordinates.

saw the rescues of more than 6,000 migrants at sea on Friday and Saturday, and hundreds more on Sunday - including at least eight bodies. With the Greek smuggling route largely closed off, the path of least resistance has drifted to Libya - a sprawling, lawless country with a huge coast and competing rebel and government factions. Migrants have flooded into Libya from across Africa, producing a bonanza for smugglers.

The first call for help often comes on a satellite telephone directly from a smuggling boat. On that April day, rescuers found two jampacked boats with 152 people - 66 in a rubber boat, 86 in a wooden boat - 56 nautical miles from the Libyan coast. Fede Gomez, an Half a dozen rescuers quickly put on wetsuits Argentinean rescuer, told those on the inflatout in unprintable torrents.

Hours pass by, more migrants are rescued at sea. Eventually 230 are on aboard, coming from Bangladesh, Pakistan, Niger, Mali, Eritrea, Guinea and Sudan, among other countries. The boat now heads to Trapani, Sicily. It has to slow down, since it's Thursday afternoon and passengers can't be taken off until Saturday morning. If the boat gets into port too early, the rescuers fear the migrants will jump into the water and try to swim to Italy. Each rescue brings another story, often full of heartbreak but with a common theme - a dream for a better life, an escape from fear or hunger.

The ordeal

Yakubu Yahya, a 17-year-old from Niger, went to Libya searching for his missing parents and was kidnapped in the Libyan city of Sabha while crossing the Saharan Desert. His kidnappers demanded \$2,000 - an unimaginable figure to him - and he was beaten almost constantly until he managed to escape. Eventually, he found enough work in Libya to scrape together \$400 enough to pay a smuggler to get him to the coast and then get onto the smuggler's boat. Nuy Hassen, 16, left Eritrea when he was six and spent a decade traveling through Ethiopia, Sudan and the Sahara Desert.—AP

US 'IS USING AFGHANISTAN AS A WEAPON TESTING GROUND' AFGHAN EX-PRESIDENT: MASSIVE US BOMB AN 'ATROCITY'

KABUL: Former Afghan President Hamid Karzai said yesterday that the US is using Afghanistan as a weapons testing ground, calling the recent use of the largest-ever non-nuclear bomb "an immense atrocity against the Afghan people." Last week, US forces dropped the GBU-43 Massive Ordnance Air Blast (MOAB) bomb in eastern Nangarhar province, reportedly killing 95 militants. Karzai, in an interview with The Associated Press, objected to the decision, saying that his country "was used very disrespectfully by the US to test its weapons of mass destruction."

The office of President Ashraf Ghani said following the bomb's usage that there was "close coordination" between the US military and the Afghan government over the operation, and they were careful to prevent any civilian casualties. But Karzai harshly criticized the Afghan government for allowing the use of the bomb. "How could a government of a country allow the use of a weapon of mass destruction on its own territory? Whatever the reason, whatever the cause, how could they allow that? It just unimaginable," he said.

The strike was carried out Thursday morning against an Islamic State group tunnel complex, carved into a mountain in Nangarhar province, that Afghan forces had tried to assault repeatedly in recent weeks, according to Afghan officials.

US and Afghan forces have been battling the Taleban for more than 15 years. But the US military unveiled the largest conventional bomb in its arsenal against the Islamic State group, which has a far smaller but growing presence in Afghanistan. US President Donald Trump has publicly vowed to aggressively confront IS.

Trump called the operation a "very, very successful mission" but Karzai had harsh words for the new US leader. "My message to President Trump today is that he has committed an immense atrocity against the Afghan people, against fellow human beings," he said. "If the American government sees us as human beings, then they have committed a crime against fellow human beings, but if they treat us as less than human beings, well, of course they can do whatever they want." The US estimates 600-800 IS fighters are in Afghanistan, mostly in Nangarhar. American forces have has concentrated on fighting them while also supporting local Afghan forces against the Taleban.

In another development, an Afghan official says that Taleban militants have stoned a man and a woman accused of adultery to death. Salim Sallhe, spokesman for the governor of Logar province, said the incident happened on Sunday in a remote area of the Mohammad Agha district where the government does not hold authority. Sallhe says a preliminary police investigation says the stoning did not take place in public. Elsewhere in northern Sari Pul province, officials say Taleban militants killed three women and a young boy who were accused of spying. Zabiullah Amani, the spokesman for the provincial governor, said the victims were accused of providing the government with information from inside Taleban-held territory. Taleban Spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid had no comment on the two reports. — Agencies

"Our city and our factory are like a big anthill," said the other driver Sergey. "They are trying to destroy our anthill with shellings, but we, like ants, fix it all together, bring back the light, and it lives again." — AFP

SOUTH KOREA EX-PRESIDENT PARK INDICTED FOR BRIBERY

SEOUL: Ousted South Korean President Park Geun-Hye was yesterday charged with bribery involving millions of dollars over the massive corruption and influence-peddling scandal that brought her down. Park, whose impeachment was confirmed by Seoul's top court last month, is at the centre of a sprawling graft investigation, which has also implicated top businessmen and brought millions of people onto the streets.

The former leader, already detained at a centre near Seoul, also faces charges of abusing her powers and leaking state secrets, Seoul prosecutors probing the scandal said in a statement. "We have formally charged Park... with multiple offences including abuse of power, coercion, bribery and leaking state secrets," they said after wrapping up the months-long investigation. Park is accused of colluding with her confidante at the heart of the scandal, Choi Soon-sil, who is already on trial for coercing local conglomerates into donating a total of 77.4 billion won (\$68 million) to two nonprofit foundations.

Choi allegedly used some of the donations for personal gain. Park is also accused of offering policy favours to top businessmen who enriched Choi, including Samsung heir Lee Jae-Yong who was arrested earlier and is also on trial for bribery. Prosecutors yesterday also charged Shin Dong-Bin, the chairman of the retail giant Lotte Group, with bribing Choi and Park. Shin allegedly offered seven billion won (\$6.15 million) to a sports foundation linked with Choi in exchange for a policy favor from Park over Lotte's duty-free business.

Park, 65-year-old daughter of the late former dictator Park Chung-Hee, spent nearly two decades living in Seoul's sprawling presidential palace, before the allegations of corruption engulfed her presidency late last year. The scandal sent her once-bulletproof approval ratings to record lows with millions taking to the streets for months calling for her ouster, though she also had a loyal following from groups of mainly older rival protesters. Her father is widely revered by aged, conservative South Koreans who benefited from the rapid economic growth under his iron-fisted rule from 1961 to 1979.

Parliament impeached Park last December and she lost her executive privilege-including protection from criminal indictment-last month when the Constitutional Court confirmed her impeachment, sending her into detention. The scandal also shed light on her questionable, decades-long ties to Choi and Choi's father, a shady religious figure who wielded huge influence on Park from the 1970s until his death in 1994. — AFP

REMOVAL OF THAI REVOLUTION PLAQUE RAISES DEMOCRACY CONCERNS

BANGKOK: Opponents of Thailand's military government expressed fears for the future of democracy yesterday after the mysterious removal of a plaque marking a

1932 revolution that ended absolute monarchy. No group has claimed responsibility, but the disappearance of the hubcap-sized brass symbol has stirred anger

in Thailand, where elections are promised but power is firmly in the hands of the rulgenerals and King Maha ing Vajiralongkorn. The junta said it had no idea who had removed the plaque, which had been embedded in concrete at a square in Bangkok's leafy historic quarter. It is close to parliament, to a royal throne hall and to an army barracks. The area is also surveyed by several police posts.

The plaque went missing on Friday, police said, and was replaced by one celebrating the monarchy. "Why should we take responsibility? If that is the case should we take responsibility for everything that disappears in this country?" Veerachon Sukhonthapatipark, a deputy government spokesman, told Reuters. Police said they were investigating. The removal of the plaque comes nearly three years after the army overthrew an elected government in the name of ending violent political turmoil it blamed on civilian politicians in the Southeast Asian country.

Although the junta has promised elections - now expected by the end of next year - critics say a new constitution is designed to ensure the military's influence over civilian politics for years to come. "The plaque was a symbol of equality in Thailand," Thanawut Wichaidit, spokesman for the opposition United Front of Democracy Against Dictatorship group said. "Past governments never thought about taking the plaque out but this government, with its extraordinary powers that are above the law, has allowed this to happen which begs the question of when and whether Thailand will truly return to democracy."

Petition

A Change.org petition demanding an investigation into the missing plaque had attracted more than 2,400 signatures. The plague marked a spot where a crucial stage in the events of 1932 unfolded. The coup was staged by Western-influenced young civilian bureaucrats and army officers to end absolute monarchy and establish a parliamentary system. Over subsequent decades, the army gained a central role and Thailand has experienced a repeated cycle of elections, coups and protests. The new constitution is the 20th since then.

Though a constitutional monarchy, the Thai crown is a powerful political force and late King Bhumibol Adulyadej sometimes intervened during times of crisis. His son, King Maha Vajiralongkorn, who ascended the throne last year, has shown himself increasingly assertive requesting changes to the new constitution that underlined his powers before signing it into law this month. Rights groups say freedom of expression has sunk to new lows under royalist Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha. Several government critics have been jailed

under strict laws against insulting the monarchy that carry a sentence of up to 15 years for each offence.

At least 74 people have been charged with lese majeste crimes since the military took power in 2014 according to iLaw, a Bangkok-based legal monitoring group. Half of them have been jailed. For more than a decade, Thailand has seen colourcoded protests - mostly by conservative, royalist "yellow shirts" and their opponents, the red-shirted supporters of new populist political forces. They see attempts by the military-led establishment to exert control over politics as a threat to Thailand's democracy, that can trace its roots back to 1932.

Not everyone was unhappy with the removal of the plaque. "It was a reminder for Thailand to follow Western democracy... which might not be suited to Thailand anyway," Nathadej Meksawat, a retired Thai army officer and political observer, wrote on his Facebook page. For Sunai Phasuk, Thailand researcher for US-based group Human Rights Watch, the removal of the plaque and the start of a fourth year under military rule marked a bleak chapter. "The reaction to the disappearance of the plaque is very telling of the challenges and the tension between supporters of a return to pre-1932 Thailand and, on the other hand people who strive for democracy," said Sunai. —Reuters

US COULD TAKE 'TOUGHER' STANCE AGAINST PAKISTAN

ISLAMABAD: US National Security Advisor Lieutenant General HR McMaster arrived in Islamabad yesterday on an unannounced visit, a day after he hinted the US could take a tougher stance on Pakistan. It was the first visit by a top member of President Donald Trump's administration to the militancy-hit South Asian country, and came after a stop in neighboring Afghanistan where he suggested Washington may take a stronger line on Islamabad, for years seen as an unreliable US ally.

A statement issued by Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's office said McMaster had "assured the Prime Minister that the new administration was committed to strengthening bilateral relations and working with Pakistan, to achieve peace and stability in Afghanistan and in the wider South Asian region." McMaster's visits are being closely watched for clues as to the Trump administration's future course of action in the region.

US-led NATO troops have been at war in Afghanistan since 2001, after the ousting of the Taleban regime for refusing to hand over Osama bin Laden following the 9/11 attacks in the United States. The US has around 8,400 troops in the country with about another 5,000 from NATO allies, as efforts to negotiate a lasting peace settlement between Kabul and the Taleban have repeatedly fallen through.

Afghanistan routinely accuses Pakistan of providing safe haven to the Afghan Taleban. "As all of us have hoped for many many years, we have hoped that Pakistani leaders will understand that it is in their interest to go after these groups less selectively than they have in the past and the best way to pursue their interest in Afghanistan and elsewhere is through diplomacy not through the use of proxies that engage in violence" McMaster said in an interview with Afghanistan's Tolo News Sunday. The Pakistani statement added that McMaster's delegation included Lisa Curtis, who US media have previously reported as his pick as senior director for South and Central Asia.

Curtis, a well known conservative expert, recently co-authored a paper calling on the US to stop treating Pakistan as an ally and instead "focus on diplomatically isolating" it if it continues to support groups that have links to international terror. NEPAL CONVICTS 3 SOLDIERS OF KILLING GIRL DURING CIVIL WAR

KATHMANDU: Three former Nepalese soldiers have each been sentenced in absentia to 20 years in jail for killing a teenage girl, only the second conviction for crimes committed during a decade-long civil war which ended in 2006. Fifteen-year-old Maina Sunuwar was tortured and killed after she was detained by the army in 2004 for alleged links to Maoist rebels. But a military tribunal the following year ruled that her death was accidental and charged the three soldiers involved in the case with only minor offences.

Maina's mother brought a case in a civilian court which delivered its verdict on Sunday, a court official told AFP.But none of the three convicted are currently in custody, and rights groups have raised concerns they may never serve their sentences. A fourth soldier, the most senior of all those accused, was acquitted. "We have fought for justice for so many years, I'm glad the court has understood our plight," Sunuwar's mother Devi said.

"But our fight is not over. I'm worried the

decision might be limited to paper. The state must implement the court's decision." Devi campaigned for years for justice for her daughter, who was arrested when soldiers came to their home looking for her mother. Devi had days earlier publicly accused government forces of raping and murdering her niece. "We believed that Maina had been taken, and perhaps killed, only to punish her mother," said Advocacy Forum Nepal, a legal rights group, in a report about the long-running case.

A military tribunal in 2005 found that Sunuwar had been repeatedly held under water and given electric shocks to her feet and wrists during interrogation. But it ruled that her death was accidental and the three soldiers named in the case were only charged with minor offences, including using improper interrogation techniques and failing to follow procedure. They were sentenced to six months in detention but released immediately because the tribunal ruled they had already served their time while confined to barracks. —AFP

The first grilling was filed last week by three opposition lawmakers. The two motions will be discussed on April 25 and a date for their debate is expected to be set. The two grillings accuse the prime minister of failing to check rampant corruption and for reducing public subsidies and raising prices of public services and

commodities in order to finance the budget deficit resulting from low oil income. Opposition MPs have also threatened to file other motions to grill several ministers amid a looming political crisis in the country less than six months from the snap polls in which the opposition won half of the 50 seats.

In a related development, MP Saleh Ashour said that the prime minister must face the two grillings in public and rejected any attempts to delay them.

The 'Yes' camp won 51.41 percent in Sunday's referendum, according to complete results released by election authorities. But the opposition immediately cried foul, claiming a clean vote would have made a difference of several percentage points and handed them victory. The main opposition Republican People's Party (CHP) and the pro-Kurdish Peoples' Democratic Party (HDP) said they would challenge the results from most ballot boxes due to alleged violations. "There is only one decision to ease the situation in the context of the law the Supreme Election Board (YSK) should annul the vote," the Dogan news agency quoted CHP deputy leader Bulent Tezcan as saying.

The referendum has no "democratic legitimacy", HDP spokesman and lawmaker Osman Baydemir told reporters in Ankara. There were sporadic protests in Istanbul with hundreds of people crowding the anti-Erdogan Besiktas district, blowing whistles and chanting "we are against fascism", an AFP correspondent said.

The opposition had already complained of an unfair campaign that saw the 'Yes' backers swamp the airwaves and use billboards across the country in a saturation advertising campaign. International observers agreed the campaign was conducted on an "unlevel playing field" and that the vote count itself was marred by late procedural changes that removed key safeguards. "The legal framework... remained inadequate for the holding of a genuinely democratic referendum," the OSCE Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights (ODIHR) and the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE) monitors said in a joint statement.

The Turkish opposition was particularly incensed by a decision by the YSK to allow voting papers without official stamps to be counted, which they said opened the way for fraud. "Late changes in counting procedures removed an important safeguard," said Cezar Florin Preda, the head of the PACE delegation. But coup. Erdogan told the mission to "know your place", saying Turkey had no intention of paying any attention to the report. He added: "This country held the most democratic polls that have never been seen in any other country in the West."

Erdogan earlier congratulated cheering supporters at Ankara's airport for "standing tall" in the face of the "crusader mentality" of the West. Turkey's Western allies have shown little enthusiasm for congratulating Erdogan and the president has given ominous signs of a looming crisis with the EU. Erdogan reaffirmed he would now hold talks on reinstating capital punishment, a move that would automatically end Turkey's EU bid, and would hold a referendum if it did not get enough votes in parliament to become law.

German Foreign Minister Sigmar Gabriel said that if Ankara were to bring back the death penalty, the move would be "synonymous with the end of the European dream" and mark the end of decades of talks to enter the EU. In an interview in the Bild newspaper to be published today, he warned Turkey that "joining would not work right now". But Erdogan said Turkey could hold a referendum on the membership bid. "What George, Hans or Helga say does not interest us," he said, using typical European names.

Turkey's new political system is due to come into effect after elections in Nov 2019, although Erdogan is expected to rapidly rejoin the ruling Justice Development Party (AKP) he founded but had to leave when he became president. It would dispense with the prime minister's post and centralize the entire executive bureaucracy under the president, giving Erdogan the direct power to appoint ministers.

In a bid to get back to business, Erdogan was yesterday to chair a cabinet and security meeting at his presidential palace that could extend the nine-month state of emergency brought in after last July's failed coup. Erdogan's victory was far tighter than expected, emerging only after several nail-biting hours late Sunday which saw the 'No' result dramatically catch up. Turkey's three largest cities - Istanbul, Ankara and Izmir - all voted 'No' although 'Yes' prevailed in Erdogan's Anatolian heartland. — Agencies

placed in solitary confinement, but Librati did not confirm that. Hunger strikes by Palestinian prisoners occur regularly, but rarely on such a large scale. Protests were also held in Palestinian cities in connection with Prisoners Day, including one in Bethlehem that led to clashes with Israeli forces. Barghouti's call for the strike has given it added credibility, with the 57year-old serving five life sentences over his role in the violent second Palestinian intifada. He is popular among Palestinians, with polls suggesting he could win the Palestinian presidency.

Graffiti showing the iconic image of his cuffed hands raised above his head flashing a peace sign while being led away by Israeli authorities can be seen in the West Bank. "Decades of experience have proved that Israel's inhumane system of colonial and military occupation aims to break the spirit of prisoners and the nation to which they belong, by inflicting suffering on their bodies, separating them from their families and communities, using humiliating measures to compel subjugation," Barghouti wrote in a New York Times op-ed. "In spite of such treatment, we will not surrender to it."

Issa Qaraqe, head of prisoner affairs for the Palestinian Authority, said that "around 1,300 Palestinian prisoners" were on hunger strike and the number could rise. The Palestinian Prisoners' Club NGO put the number at 1,500. Librati said that some 1,100 detainees in several prisons had announced their intention to go on hunger strike. "The prisons service has started taking disciplinary measures against the strikers and in addition a number of prisoners have been transferred to separate wings," he said. "It is to be emphasized that the (prison service) does not negotiate with prisoners."

Some 6,500 Palestinians are currently detained by Israel for a range of offences and alleged crimes. Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas, in a statement carried by official news agency WAFA, "called on the international community to save the life of the Palestinian prisoners in Israeli jails". Barghouti's wife Fadwa told AFP at a demonstration in Ramallah that prisoners' demands were in line with "international law and recognized as part of human rights". The last largescale hunger strike was in February 2013, when 3,000 Palestinians refused to eat for one day in protest at the death of a fellow detainee.

Israel says it must be vigilant to prevent fresh violence, particularly following a wave of knife, gun and car-ramming attacks that erupted in Oct 2015. Such incidents have greatly subsided in recent months. While many Palestinians view Barghouti as a hero, Israelis point to the bloody suicide attacks of the second intifada and his role in the uprising.

For Palestinians, the prisons have become a stark symbol of Israel's occupation. Those on hunger strike have issued a list of demands, including access to phones, extended visiting rights and better medical care. Israeli public radio reported that Public Security Minister Gilad Erdan has ordered intervention units to be put on standby and a field hospital to be set up outside one prison to avoid having to take sick prisoners to civilian hospitals. It quoted Erdan as saying that the demands regarding prisoners' conditions were unreasonable.

Some Israeli analysts have sought to highlight the rivalry between Barghouti and Abbas within their Fatah party, suggesting his call for a hunger strike was also related to internal politics. Abbas made no mention of Barghouti in his statement on WAFA. Talk of who will succeed Abbas has intensified, but the 82-year-old has shown no sign of stepping down and a recent Fatah congress saw him shore up his support base and sideline rivals. He has not publicly designated a successor.

Of the 6,500 Palestinian detainees, 62 are women and 300 are minors. Some 500 are held under administrative detention, which allows for imprisonment without charges or trial. Thirteen Palestinian lawmakers are also among the detainees. Israeli-Palestinian peace efforts have been at a standstill since a US-led initiative collapsed three years ago. — AFP

ZIMBABWE GOLD **RUSH FEVER LEAVES** TRAIL OF DESTRUCTION

housands of unemployed Zimbabweans have turned to illegal gold panning in a bid to survive the country's deteriorating economy, leaving a trail of destruction that has alarmed farmers, timber plantation owners and the country's environmental authorities. Peasant miners have set up makeshift mines on farmland and timber plantations in the country's eastern provinces, which border Mozambique where gold fetches a higher price.

Deep tunnels have been dug beneath roads, railways and buildings in the Kwekwe area of the Midlands province. In some parts of Manicaland province, waterways have been diverted and roads destroyed. With more illegal miners likely to exploit the area as the economy continues to slump, and the state placing responsibility to act on landowners, farmers are fearful of irreversible damage to their land, and the risk of losing their livelihoods.

"Kwekwe is under siege from illegal miners and some of these miners are very violent. We don't know what to do," resident Jonas Dube told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. Simon Simango, an illegal gold miner in Chimanimani, Manicaland province, acknowledged that the excavations were having a negative impact on the environment. But many workers had run out of options, he said. "This (illegal mining) is our only source of livelihood. Look, there are no jobs in the country," Simango told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "We sell most of our gold to illegal buyers from Mozambique who are offering us very good prices."

Miners report that buyers in Zimbabwe paid around \$30 per gram of gold while buyers in Mozambique were paying, double at around \$60 per gram. Zimbabwe has never fully recovered from an economic slump that began in 2000 with the violent seizure of thousands of white-owned farms. Unemployment runs at 80 percent, and even those with jobs face unpaid wages and an acute shortage of cash.



ERDOGAN MUST HEAL DIVIDED **TURKEY**

urkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan must heal a divided country after narrowly winning a contested referendum, but it is unclear whether he is interested in forging the compromises needed for reconciliation, analysts say. After months of campaigning, with the 'Yes' side dominating the airwaves and posters on the streets, 51.41 percent of the electorate voted for an executive presidency, expanding Erdogan's powers. But some 48.59 percent on Sunday voted against, according to nearly-complete results from election authorities. The 'No' was in front in 33 of Turkey's 81 provinces, notably in major cities.

The campaign polarized the country. Erdogan railed against enemies abroad and traitors at home with his usual combative style, even accusing European countries of "Nazi practices" last month during the crisis in relations with the European Union. Videos shared online by pro-government journalists and social media users made comparisons between Kurdish separatists and former far-right nationalist party members voting for 'No', suggesting "terrorists" were against constitutional changes. Prime Minister Binali Yildirim said at the ruling Justice and Development Party (AKP) headquarters on Sunday night said "no one's heart should be broken" after the 'Yes' won. "There are no losers in this referendum, the winner is Turkey, the winner is the dear people," Yildirim told supporters. But Erdogan ignored warnings from the EU over bringing back the death penalty and repeated he would approve any bill for its return and even could hold a referendum on the issue if necessary. He urged "other countries and institutions to show respect to the decision of the nation", and did not show a softening in his rhetoric against the West. Meanwhile, two main opposition parties, the Republican People's Party (CHP) and the Peoples' Democratic Party (HDP) said they would challenge the result, alleging major violations.

'Continue robust approach'

Analysts agreed even with such a "razorthin" mandate and opposition challenges, Erdogan would defiantly continue his style of politics. "I don't think Erdogan will change the robust and muscular approach to politics that he has adopted so far," said Fadi Hakura of the British thinktank Chatham House. "If anything, I suspect he will double down on his very hardline and tough and uncompromising style of politics."

There is no official data on the number of illegal miners in Zimbabwe. However, a report by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization estimated that between 2007 and 2012, some 500,000 illegal, artisanal gold miners were operating in the country. Experts believe these numbers could grow as the economy continues to falter.

'Shocking'

In Tarka Forest, a timber estate owned by Allied Timbers in Chimanimani district, more than 600 hectares of prime timber have been damaged to make way for the illegal digs, according to company executives. Manicaland's minister of provincial affairs, Mandi Chimene, said in February that illegal gold mining in Tarka Forest had reached "alarming levels", and resulted in the pollution of streams and rivers, and destruction of standing timber. "What is happening in Tarka (Forest) is shocking," Chimene said. "We wonder who is benefiting from the illegal gold because as a country, we are not. Such gold is not going to the legal market."

The government says it is the responsibility of landowners or affected businesses to evict the illegal miners. "If it's a forest plantation, it is the responsibility of the timber companies to remove the illegal miners," Minister for Mines and Mining Development Walter Chidhakwa told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "If an area belongs to the timber plantations, the government cannot legalize gold mining in the area. The companies must put measures in to stop illegal mining in their plantations." The same rule applies to illegal miners on privately-owned farmland, he said.

Darlington Duwa, CEO of the Timber Producers Federation, warned of lasting damage as a result of the disappearing forests and water pollution caused by illegal mining. "It (illegal mining) reduces the timber resource, thus affecting direct and indirect employment, economic development, foreign currency earnings and leads to environmental degradation and reduced resilience to climate change effects," Duwa told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "In some areas illegal miners (settlers) uproot young trees that have been planted," Duwa said. "At this rate, the industry is bound to suffer irreversible damage." — Reuters

FINANCIERS POUR BILLIONS INTO US SHALE

nvestors who took a hit last year when dozens of US shale producers filed for bankruptcy are already making big new bets on the industry's resurgence. In the first quarter, private equity funds raised \$19.8 billion for energy ventures - nearly three times the total in the same period last year, according to financial data provider Preqin. The quickening pace of investments from private equity, along with hedge funds and investment banks, comes even as the recovery in oil prices from an 8-year low has stalled at just over \$50 per barrel amid a stubborn global supply glut.

The shale sector has become increasingly attractive to investors not because of rising oil prices, but rather because producers have achieved startling cost reductions - slashing up to half the cost of pumping a barrel in the past two years. Investors also believe the glut will dissipate as demand for oil steadily rises. That gives financiers confidence that they can squeeze increasing returns from shale fields - without price gains - as technology continues to cut costs. So they are backing shale-oil veterans and assembling companies that can quickly start pumping.

"Shale funders look at the economics today and see a lot of projects that work in the \$40 to \$55 range" per barrel of oil, said Howard Newman, head of private equity fund Pine Brook Road Partners, which last month committed to invest \$300 million in startup Admiral Permian Resources LLC to drill in West Texas. Data on investments by hedge funds and other nonpublic investment firms is scant, but the rush of new private equity money indicates broader enthusiasm in shale plays. "Demand for oil has been more robust than anyone imagined three years ago," said Mark Papa, chief executive of Centennial Resource Development Inc.

Papa referred to the beginning of an international oil price crash in 2014, which took many firms in the shale sector to the brink of bankruptcy. Centennial is a Permian oil producer backed by private equity fund Riverstone. Papa, a well-known shale industry entrepreneur, built EOG Resources Inc into one of the most profitable US shale producers before he retired in 2013. The chance to further develop the Permian, he said, was enough for him to come out of retirement to deliver one of its bigger recent successes. The value of Riverstone's original \$500 million investment has grown nearly four times since Centennial's initial public offering last fall.

'A Ton of Private Capital'

Riverstone this year copied the Centennial model, putting experienced managers atop a startup charged with acquiring operations or assets. The equity fund hired Jim Hackett - the former head of shale producer Anadarko Petroleum Corp - to run the newly created Silver Run Acquisition Corp II. Hedge funds Highfields Capital Management LP and Adage Capital Management have taken stakes in the new company, which has a valuation of about \$1 billion after going public last month.

Private equity fund NGP Natural Resources XI LP invested \$524 million last fall in Luxe Energy LLC, a shale producer formed in 2015 by former Statoil executives. NGP's investment was effectively a bet that Luxe could repeat its success of early 2016. Then, NGP contributed about \$250 million to Luxe, which used the money to acquire land in the Permian - and sold it seven months later for a doubledigit profit.

This year's drilling rush could be tested if global supplies grow too fast or if demand cools. The US drilling rig count is rising at its fastest pace in six years and US crude stockpile are close to 533 million barrels - near an all-time high and enough to supply the United States for 25 days. But some investors say even a decline of \$10 in the oil price would not dissuade them. "There is a ton of private capital to invest in the US oil industry," said Gerrit Nicholas, cofounder of private equity fund Orion Energy Partners.

Nicholas said he is comfortable lending even if oil prices fall to \$40 per barrel. Orion this month helped finance the expansion of a Florida oil-storage terminal, a move predicated in part on growth in US oil exports. Since the US lifted its oil export ban last year, crude exports have climbed to about 746,000 barrels per day, according to US Energy Information Administration data.

Betting on OPEC's Self-Interest

The oil industry has seen boom-and-bust cycles since the first well was drilled about 160 years ago, and industry and government have sought to tame the volatility for just as long. Texas regulators set output quotas from the 1920s through the 1970s, a practice that served as a model for the creation of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC). The US boom has caused concern among OPEC member nations ahead of its meeting next month in Vienna, where they will consider extending oil production cuts that first took effect in January. Investors believe the cartel's members will extend the cuts because it is in OPEC's financial interest to prevent a steep drop in oil prices.

That likely will keep money flowing to nimble US oil producers and the companies that provide them with services and equipment. Investors see the United States as the new swing producer, having the ability to quickly increase supply in response to any sudden increase in demand. "The US, with its substantial inventory capacity and swing oil producer status, should see strong onshore activity for the next few years," said Charlie Leykum, founder of private equity fund CSL Capital Management LLC, in an interview.

CSL has invested in several oilfield service business in the past year. It partnered with Goldman Sachs and Baker Hughes Inc, for instance, to create a shale services company. Centennial's Papa expects the flood of fresh capital to push US production up 23 percent to 11.3 million barrels a day (bpd) by 2020, based on strong demand for oil. "We're still in a hydrocarbon-based economy," said Papa.— Reuters

ROME: Italian veteran Michele Scarponi took his first victory in four years as he claimed victory yesterday's opening stage of the Tour of the Alps. The 37-year-old outsprinted Briton Geraint Thomas and Thibaut Pinot of France to claim the early lead of the race following a 142km stage from Kufstein to Innsbruck in Austria. The race is one of the key warm-up events ahead of next month's Giro d'Italia, the first of the year's Grand Tours. Scarponi won the Alps Tour in 2011, the same year he took Giro honours. He will be the leader of the Kazakh team Astana at the Giro this year following an injury to compatriot Fabio Aru. Thomas and Pinot are expected to challenge for overall Giro victory alongside Vuelta a Espana champion Nairo Quintana and Italian Vincenzo Nibali a winner of all three Grand Tours.— AFP

VALKENBURG: Philippe Gilbert will miss the rest of the Ardennes classics season, including Sunday's prestigious Liege-Bastogne-Liege race, due to a kidney problem, his Quick Step team revealed yesterday. Just 24 hours after continuing his fine start to the season by winning the Amstel Gold Raceone of the three major Ardennes classics-Gilbert, 33, said he was in pain and would need some time off.

"When I fell (at Amstel), I felt the pain again but once back on the bike, the pain disappeared again," said the Belgian, who is being kept overnight in hospital. "Unfortunately, after the finish I felt once again pain in the base of my back and, alongside the doctor, I went to hospital for a check-up. "Fortunately there's nothing serious and everything's fine-I'll recommence training in a week." As well as missing Liege, which he won in 2011, Gilbert will also skip Wednesday's La Fleche Wallonne, another race he claimed six years ago when he did the Ardennes treble.

This season he has already won one of cycling's 'Monument' races-the Tour of Flanders two weeks ago-as well as Three Days of De Panne. Alongside compatriot Greg Van Avermaet and Poland's Michal Kwiatkowski, whom he beat in a sprint finish on Sunday for his fourth Amstel success, he has been one of the stand-out performers during the first few months of the season. "It's been one of my best years and, when I look at my results, I'm delighted," added the Quick Step rider, who was world champion in 2012. "Being competitive at the same time on the cobbled and Ardennes classics, helping the team to be the best in the world, gives me a lot of satisfaction."— AFP

MERCEDES MULL TEAM ORDERS TO FOIL FERRARI

MANAMA: Mercedes team chief Toto Wolff says he is considering introducing team orders in a bid to halt Ferrari's momentum in this year's world championship. In the wake of Sebastian Vettel's second win of the season in Bahrain on Sunday Wolff admitted that it may be difficult for Mercedes to continue to allow their drivers total freedom - and may ask new boy Valtteri Bottas to take the role of a 'number two' driver.

The Finn was asked to allow three-time champion Lewis Hamilton to pass him in Manama as he laboured in pursuit of Vettel in a scenario that may be repeated regularly, if reluctantly."We don't like it at all," said Wolff, mindful of the team's tradition for open 'terms of engagement' that allowed intense competition between Hamilton and retired 2016 world champion Nico Rosberg in the last three years. "It's not what we have done in the last couple of years, but the situation is different now... So, it needs a proper analysis of what it means and where we are... "We'd like to give equal opportunity at the start of the race. I think we owe it to them.

"Then you see what we did in the this racewe made the call, we made the call twice, because we felt it was the only possibility of winning the race..." For the first time in four years, Mercedes have lost their supreme dominance and face a serious battle to hang on to their drivers' and constructors' titles as a revived Ferrari have gained the initiative. In Bahrain, Ferrari's aggressive strategy and tactics made the champions look rattled and ponderous as Vettel followed up his win in the season-opening Australian Grand Prix to take a clear lead in the championship. By seeking not to give either driver any advantage over the other, Mercedes were unable to respond immediately and delayed their decision-making after Ferrari's early move to make an 'under-cut' pit stop.

Wolff said he did not favour abandoning the team policy of giving the drivers' equality and rejected the idea of backing the driver who took pole position, or was most advanced on the grid. "That would be too harsh," he said. "It would be the opposite of what we have done through the years. It's important, as we start the race, to give them equal opportunity. "We would probably have taken a different decision if Valtteri had run at the front, with the problem on the tyres, and Lewis would have been second, but with Vettel, between them, there was nothing we could have done.

"That's why it was the perfect storm.... "It is our mind-set and our racing philosophy, until now, that we have given them both equal opportunity. Like here, if you have two cars starting on the front row - if they run second and first, you just have to let them race. "When you have a problem on the car, as we had (with Bottas' rear tyres), then it is a situation to consider-to swap them - but with a Ferrari in between, we couldn't. Three races into the season, you don't want to go there yet."

Bottas' problems with his rear tyres were caused by a generator failure on the grid that meant the team could not bleed the air pressures for the race. Vettel's win lifted him top of the drivers' championship with 68 points ahead of Hamilton on 61 and Bottas on 38. It triggered celebrations in Italy where confidence in Ferrari has soared, but has left Mercedes with a problem to solve just three races into the 2017 season. Sochi stages the Russian Grand Prix on Sunday.— AFP

HEARN REJECTS O'SULLIVAN'S 'BULLYING' CHARGE

SHEFFIELD: World Snooker chairman Barry Hearn denied claims of "bullying" and "intimidation" from Ronnie O'Sullivan, saying the five-times world champion had made "unfounded" and "inaccurate" allegations. O'Sullivan slammed Hearn and snooker's hierarchy shortly after beating Gary Wilson 10-7 in the first round of this year's World Championship at Sheffield's Crucible Theatre in northern England on Sunday.

The 41-year-old felt he had been harshly

Post-match interviews have seen O'Sullivan deliberately and repeatedly respond with one-word answers, while he gave an interview to British television channel ITV at the World Grand Prix in February using a 'robotic' voice Following the Wilson match, O'Sullivan yet again raised the possibility of his retirement as he criticised Hearn and snooker's authorities. "I phoned Barry up four weeks ago and I said, 'Barry, I'm done with all you and your board of

VETTEL VICTORIES COULD FORCE A MERCEDES RETHINK

MANAMA: Formula One world champions Mercedes have indicated they may increasingly have to favour Lewis Hamilton over new team mate Valtteri Bottas to counter the threat posed by Ferrari's Sebastian Vettel. In practice, that is likely to mean the reluctant imposition of more of the socalled 'team orders' used in Sunday's Bahrain Grand Prix. "We don't like that, at all." team boss Toto Wolff told reporters after Bottas twice obeyed radio instructions to let the faster Hamilton through to chase eventual winner and championship leader Vettel. "It's not what we have done in the last couple of years but the situation is different now so it needs a proper analysis of what it means and where we are."

Mercedes have never had a designated number one driver, and Wolff said the desire was to give both equal opportunity at the start of the race. The team won all but two races last season but are no longer dominant in a championship that has for the past three years been an internal battle. Vettel has now won two of three races and is seven points clear of Hamilton. Finland's Kimi Raikkonen, Vettel's 2007 champion team mate who has yet to stand on the podium this season and not been on pole since 2008, slipped 34 points behind-half as many as the German.

Bottas, who joined Mercedes in January as replacement for now-retired world champion Nico Rosberg, is 23 adrift of his team mate. Wolff said the situation at Ferrari had to be taken into consideration. "That is the interesting question that we need to analyse at the moment and I don't want to pre-empt what the consequence will be, or if there will be a consequence," he added. The disparity between the current Mercedes pairing is more marked than before, with Bottas yet to win a race and Hamilton surpassed only by Michael Schumacher in the all-time lists with 54 victories.

Bahrain was Bottas's first career pole position, whereas Hamilton has 63 and could sail past Schumacher's record of 68 later in the year. The Finn is also still settling into his new surroundings, whereas Hamilton has been there since 2013 and is the sport's biggest personality. Hamilton had been on pole for six races in a row until Bottas broke the sequence in Bahrain and Wolff said Mercedes appeared to be still slightly ahead of Ferrari on single lap pace. "In the race it's pretty evenly matched I would say. So I think that's going to be a close one for the next couple of races."—Reuters

FORMULA ONE: OUTBURST REVEALS MCLAREN MISERY

MANAMA: Fernando Alonso's outburst of frustration and Stoffel Vandoorne's mid-race tweeted photograph summed up McLaren's failures in Sunday's Bahrain Grand Prix and hinted at deeper turmoil ahead. The Spanish two-time champion said he had never raced with so little power in his life while Belgian new boy Vandoorne posted a picture of him running on a treadmill after another engine failure had prevented him starting. Both men's action underlined the problems at McLaren where a promising chassis has been unable to show its real potential because of Honda's hapless failure to deliver a reliable and competitive engine.

The team is widely expected now to intensify its efforts to find a solution with partners Honda or to seek a new temporary engine supplier. Alonso, 35, and in the third and final year of his contract with McLaren, retired his car with an engine failure after a race spent fighting for mid-field positions. It was his third retirement in three races and may help to explain why he is so keen to take a break and miss the Monaco Grand Prix and take part in the Indianapolis 500 next month. "I have never raced with less power in my life," he said in one radio blast. When his team suggested a change of strategy, he said: "Do whatever you want, man."

Later, Alonso revealed: "The deficit in power and performance we had on the straights was amazing. Sometimes I looked in the mirrors at the beginning of the straights and saw the other cars 300, 400 metres behind... "So, I forgot completely about that car and started changing settings on the steering wheel and doing my own things, then the next thing I see when I come on the brakes is that car alongside me. "We were running close to the points but that's not enough. We never had the pace we had in Australia and China, and, in the end, we had a problem and we decided to retire the car. "When the red lights go off you're motivated and you start fighting, but you're so behind on the straights that there's no way you can defend your position. You fight in a fair way with everyone, but you don't enjoy the battle."

Vandoorne's social media post was accompanied by a comment in which he wrote: "Going for a run - you guys up to anything this Sunday?" McLaren's racing director Eric Boullier said: "What can I say? Fernando failed to finish and Stoffel failed to start. It was a bad day for McLaren-Honda and there is no point in pretending otherwise..." Alonso has suggested he is ready to consider offers from other teams later this year and reports in Spain have suggested he is already talking to Renault where he won his two world titles.—AFP

DODIN DISHES OUT 2ND SNUB TO FRENCH FED CUP TEAM

PARIS: French world number 60 Oceane Dodin risks a five-year ban after refusing to play in this weekend's Fed Cup tie against Spain. The 20-year-old was called up by last year's finalists, captained by former French great Yannick Noah, to replace injured Caroline Garcia for the world group playoff in Roanne in central France. But the French Tennis Federation announced Monday that Dodin was refusing to play, leaving her facing punishment from a simple warning to a five year ban from competition. At the Australian Open in Melbourne in January, Dodin said she was not enthusiastic about playing for her country.

Dodin's snub comes after France's number two player Garcia rejected her place in the national team 24 hours after being picked, blaming sciatic nerve pain. After losing last September's final to the Czech Republic Garcia had told the federation she did not want to take part in France's 2017 campaign. She was summoned last week to the tennis headquarters to prove her injury to a federation approved doctor. With Garcia and Dodin, missing Noah has called on world number 204 Amandine Hesse to join Alize Cornet, Kristina Mladenovic and Pauline Parmentier in Saturday and Sunday's play-off.

Dodin is coached by her father Frederic. She turned professional in 2012 and has one WTA title to her name, defeating American Lauren Davis in the final of the Quebec tournament last year. The federation revealed her decision in a Twitter post: "Oceane Dodin has refused to play, replaced by Amandine Hesse. Team in place in Roanne." France, champions in 1997 and 2003, are one of only four nations to have taken part in every Fed Cup since its inception in 1963. Spain will be without French Open champion Garbine Muguruza who is recovering from an ankle injury. They will be led by world 59 Lara Arruabarrena.— AFP



TOMIC SLUMP CONTINUES

MONTE CARLO: Bernard Tomic's slump in form continued yesterday at the Monte Carlo Open as the Australian lost a sixth straight match to exit the first major event of the clay season. WARATAHS TARGET KINGS

SYDNEY: Shoring up a leaky defense while not abandoning their attacking mindset is what the New South Wales Waratahs will endeavour to do to get their Super Rugby season back on track against the Kings on Friday, according to coach Daryl Gibson. The 2014 champions are languishing in fourth in the five-team Australian conference on eight competition points, having won just two of their seven games this season.

Their only victories have come against fellow Australian sides the Western Force and Melbourne Rebels, who are also struggling, while they conceded almost 34 points per match. "Those inconsistencies and vulnerabilities in our game is something we want to work out and learn from," Gibson said in comments published by Fairfax Media yesterday. "We need to firmly fix up our defensive qualities, which at the moment are not where they should be." That lack of defensive starch was most evident in their last game against the Wellington Hurricanes on April 7 with the 2016 champions running in five tries and establishing a 33-7 lead in the first half.

A combination of the Hurricanes temporarily losing track of what they were supposed to be doing and the Waratahs finally switching on ensured the Sydney-based side fought back in the second half before losing 38-28. At times during that game they ran the Hurricanes off Wellington Regional Stadium. Their attacking prowess from deep was most evident with fullback Bryce Hegarty threatening every time his team were able to hold onto the ball and spread it wide. "At different periods... we've showed we can be a very good football team," Gibson said. "We're going to look to ... focus on our strengths, which has been that ball-in-hand-type game and making that more consistent and more effective."

Gibson, however, said the closeness of the Australian conference meant that a victory over the Port Elizabeth-based Kings would put them back in contention for the playoffs. The ACT Brumbies, who play the Hurricanes in Napier earlier on Friday, lead the Australian conference on 17 points. Each of the four conference winners qualify for the playoffs no matter how many points they have. "The Australian conference is still very open and the focus for us is firmly on ourselves," Gibson added. "We always knew it was going to be tough. We've been shown where the level is at in terms of where we need to get to."- Reuters

BAYERN FACE FAMILIAR CHAMPIONS LEAGUE FATE

MADRID: Bayern Munich face a familiar problem as they travel to old European foes Real Madrid today needing to make history to keep faint hopes of Champions League glory alive. Cristiano Ronaldo's second-half double in Munich last week made him the first man to reach a century of European goals, but more importantly handed Madrid a vital 2-1 first leg lead. The 11-time European champions have never failed to progress after winning the first leg away from home in the Champions League. "It won't be easy, we're the underdogs, but we'll have a chance to win in Madrid," insisted Bayern captain Philipp Lahm after Saturday's 0-0 draw at Bayer Leverkusen.

Recent history, though, would say otherwise. Should Bayern fail to pull off a fightback, it will be the fourth successive season they have been eliminated by Spanish opposition. When Pep Guardiola was hired as Bayern boss in 2013, he was expected by the Bavarians' demanding hierarchy to build on Jupp Heynckes's treble and create a Bayern dynasty of the like that saw them win three consecutive European Cups between 1974-1976.

Heynckes's Bayern thrashed a worn down Barcelona left behind by Guardiola a year earlier 7-0 on aggregate on their way to winning the Champions League. However, the Germans have only known defeat in four visits to Spain since without even scoring a goal. Guardiola was three seasons. With Ancelotti's men Dortmund on their way to the humiliated on his three returns to Spain as Bayern boss in three semi-final, first legs on the way to elimination against Real, Barcelona and Atletico Madrid. Carlo Ancelotti was named as Guardiola's replacement specifically for his European nous having won the Champions League a record three times as a coach.

Yet, the Italian hasn't been able to find a solution for Bayern's Spanish travel sickness as they also lost 1-0 to Atletico on their most recent visit back in September. Bayern's struggles tell a broader tale, though, as Spanish sides have won their last 11 European ties against German opponents in the past

Lewandowski has haunted Madrid in the past, scoring four times in a famous semi-final, first leg rout for Borussia Champions League final in 2013.

And if Bayern need more encouragement, Ancelotti has shown he can dramatically turn around historic streaks in the past. Before the 2013/14 season Madrid had won just once in 25 visits to Germany. However, after smashing Schalke 6-0 in Gelsenkirchen, they went onto eliminate both Dortmund and Bayern on their way to winning the competition. A similar turnaround in Bayern's fortunes would be sweet revenge for Ancelotti on his first return to the Santiago Bernabeu since being sacked by trigger happy Real president Florentino Perez in 2015.— AFP

Sokratis''beautiful' goal

Borussia Dortmund ended a nightmare week for the club with a morale-boosting 3-1 win over Eintracht Frankfurt, capped by three dream goals. The club is still dazed after three bomb blasts rocked the team bus on the way to a Champions League game today, leaving the players dazed and defender Marc Bartra needing a wrist operation. Marco Reus capped his return after six weeks sidelined with the opening goal after 122 seconds with a deft backheel flick. Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang sprinted 70 metres for the third on 86 minutes to claim his 26th Bundesliga goal this season. But arguably the best came from defender Sokratis Papastathopoulos, who hit the ball from 23 metres out at 108km/h into the top corner on 34 minutes to give Dortmund a 2-1 lead. "It was the most beautiful goal of my career. All in all, it was a strange feeling to play today. The things which have happened are still in our heads," said the Greece international.

Rock'n'roll Nagelsmann

Julian Nagelsmann, 29, is the youngest coach in the Bundesliga's history and is on the verge of steering Hoffenheim to the Champions League for the first time. Adam Szalai and Kerem Demirbay both netted twice in Saturday's 5-3 win at home to Borussia Moenchengladbach to leave Hoffenheim third with five games left. The Bundesliga's top three qualify directly for the Champions League's group stages. Hoffenheim are just one short of the club's record points tally of 55 in the 2008/09 season and this is the first time they have won all of their last six home games. "I'd rather have a game like that a thousand times more than when both teams hold back," said Nagelsmann' Germany's coach of the year for 2016. "When you go to a concert, you don't want to hear the boring music." Hoffenheim's home game against fourth-placed Dortmund in a fortnight is set to decide which club claims a direct Champions League berth or a play-off place.

BALE RULED OUT OF CHAMPIONS LEAGUE GAME AGAINST BAYERN

MADRID: Real Madrid will be without Gareth Bale as they look to book their place in a record seventh straight Champions League semi-final against Bayern Munich today. Bale is sidelined by the recurrence of an ankle problem picked up in Madrid's 2-1 first-leg win last week and is also a doubt for Real's crunch La Liga clash with Barcelona on Sunday. The Welshman was sidelined for three months earlier in the season after suffering ligament damage in his right ankle. "Gareth worked very hard to get back into the team after his injury," said Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane yesterday. "When he came back he was desperate to be involved and now he has a small niggle that is preventing him from being fully fit.

"I hope it is nothing and in a few days he can be with us again. "He won't be fit for Bayern because we don't want to take any risks." Bale missed Real's 3-2 win at Sporting Gijon on Saturday and Zidane was far from confident he will be fit in time to face Barca. "I hope he will be with us, but we have to wait and see," he added. "It is a question of taking it day by day." By contrast, Bayern look set to be handed a huge injury boost as top scorer Robert Lewandowski returns after a shoulder injury. "We know how good a player Lewandowski is, he is a true number nine," added Zidane. "That is a plus for Bayern, but he is their player. "They have good players in all positions and we have to concentrate on our own game."

Lewandowski has scored 38 goals in 40 appearances this season and his presence was badly missed as Bayern not only slumped to defeat at home last Wednesday, but also drew a blank in a 0-0 draw at Bayer Leverkusen on Saturday. The Pole has also shown he is capable of the spectacular against Madrid-he scored all four of Borussia Dortmund's goals in a 4-1 semi-final, first-leg rout back in 2013. "Lewandowski is a quality player but it's not all about him," added Madrid midfielder Casemiro. "They've got a brilliant squad. We'll need to be at our best and not just focused on one man." Madrid have never failed to progress after winning the first leg away from home in the Champions League.

DATE WITH DESTINY AWAITS **REANIMATED JAMIE VARDY**

LONDON: When Jamie Vardy pictured himself making history in the Champions League, the record he set in Leicester City's loss to Atletico Madrid was probably not what he had in mind. The England striker came off during last week's quarter-final first leg at the Vicente Calderon having completed none of his two attempted passes, in what is thought to have been a Champions League first. Leicester's 1-0 defeat left Atletico in charge of the tie ahead of yesterday's return leg, but with Vardy now back among the goals, his team-mates hope more memorable milestones are ahead.

"Strikers go through it. I don't know why some people panic, because he is not going to score every game," said Leicester right-back Danny Simpson of Vardy's early-season struggles. "He is still the same player, it had just not been happening. But in training nothing changes with him, his attitude and his confidence. He still believes in himself." Having scored 24 goals last season in Leicester's 5,000-1 Premier League title win, Vardy found the net only five times in the first 22 games of the current campaign as his side slithered down the table.

But since Claudio Ranieri's dismissal as manager, he has been a man reborn, taking his tally to six goals in seven league games with a sharply taken effort in Saturday's 2-2 draw at Crystal Palace. While Vardy's goals have helped Leicester move clear of danger, the team's return to form under new manager Craig Shakespeare has not been to everyone's liking. Leicester's players have been accused of betraying the man who oversaw last season's fairytale, with Vardy cast as chief conspirator. "The story is out there, then people pick it up and jump on it and you're getting death threats about your family, kids, everything," he said recently. "I try to get on with it, but when people are trying to cut your missus up while she's driving along with the kids in the back of the car, it's not the best. "It's happened plenty of times. It is terrifying."

Vardy says he now gets "abuse at every stadi-

um", although he admits that he feeds on the notoriety. "Do I enjoy it? Yeah, it's just me," he says. "I wouldn't change it." The return of the angry Vardy has been a central component of Leicester's renaissance under Shakespeare, as witnessed in their last 16 second-leg victory over Sevilla. Vardy's aggressive pressing set the tone for Leicester's 2-0 win and he succeeded in getting Samir Nasri sent off for aiming a headbutt at him, an incident that left the Frenchman branding him a "a cheat".

Vardy had sown the seeds of success in the first leg, snaffling an away goal that meant Leicester returned to England with a 2-1 deficit their performance barely merited. Ranieri was

sacked the day after. It was, however, the only goal Vardy has scored in the Champions League this season. At the age of 30 and with Leicester not expected to qualify for the Champions League again in the foreseeable future, today's game may represent his last chance to leave a mark on the competition.

Unsurprisingly, he has an admirer in Atletico coach Diego Simeone. "I like him. I really rate him as a player," said the former Argentina bruiser. "As a striker he is the kind of powerful striker Atletico have had. He stretches the game and is always fighting to stop the opponent playing out from the back so he can pounce on any mistake. "Last season he was very consistent. —AFP

CHELSEA MASTERCLASS GIVES JOSE HIS MOJO BACK

LONDON: As Manchester United manager Jose Mourinho sauntered down the Old Trafford touchline ostentatiously pointing at the club crest on his gilet, the message was clear: I'm still the man. Mourinho has had a challenging first season at the United helm, with nine home draws in the league summing up his difficulties, but Sunday's 2-0 win over leaders Chelsea was a tactical masterclass. In fielding an unorthodox 3-5-2 system and charging two players with man-marking jobs, Mourinho showed his famed tactical acumen has not deserted him-and blew the Premier League title race wide open.

"United produced a brilliant attacking display as well as a convincing defensive one that was tactically aware of the different threats Chelsea posed," said former Tottenham Hotspur midfielder Jermaine Jenas, now a BBC pundit. "Mourinho has masterminded plenty of wins in big games down the years, but he usually does it with a defensive approach and by setting up with a team that, first and foremost, is very difficult to break down. "On Sunday, he flipped that model on its head. United played with two up front and with wing-backs who were high up the pitch. They were on the front foot and went at Chelsea from the start." The belligerent Ander Herrera was

the emblem of United's victory, marking Chelsea's key man Eden Hazard out of the game and claiming a goal and an assist at the other end. On the other flank, Matteo Darmian successfully stymied Pedro, leaving Chelsea striker Diego Costa with not even scraps to feed on. Marcus Rashford, meanwhile, seized a rare chance to shine at centreforward by netting United's seventhminute opener and tormenting Chelsea's back three with his penetrative running. Mourinho explained how he had shut Chelsea down with relish and claimed his side would not have lost at Stamford Bridge in the FA Cup last month had Herrera's dismissal there not disrupted his plans.

Not a template

"I was convinced even before the cup (game) that controlling the two players that play behind Diego (Costa) and controlling the full-backs would create lots of problems and I repeat the same," Mourinho said. "They are phenomenal in counter-attack. When they had the ball, we were compact and when they tried to play counter-attack, we were always in control of these two link positions." Rashford's display suggested he deserves to be given more chances through the centre, where United's top scorer Zlatan Ibrahimovic-rested on Sunday-has started almost every game this season.

"I think (Mourinho) has learnt something," former Liverpool captain Graeme Souness said on Sky Sports. "Rashford has made it difficult for him to leave him out." As well as restricting Chelsea's lead over Tottenham to four points, United's win took them to within four points of the Champions League places with a game in hand on fourth-place Manchester City. It was only United's second win this season over one of the other teams in the top six, following November's 1-0 success against an off-color Spurs.

But as the fruit of a carefully customized game plan designed to nullify the specific threats of a particular opponent, it did not represent a blueprint for future success. "(Mourinho) got his tactics spot on and enjoyed a bit of luck, but I don't see that as a template,' Souness said. "Man United have to dominate the ball here. They have to be on the front foot and get everyone in the stadium on the edge of their seat, like they have done for the best part of 20 years. "I don't think they could go and play like that every week against lesser teams who will sit in and not try and open up against them." For now, at least, Mourinho has got his mojo back.—AFP

CHINA FIRM SCRAPS DEAL TO BUY SOUTHAMPTON STAKE

SHANGHAI: China stadium builder Lander Sports Development said yesterday it had scrapped plans to buy a stake in English football club Southampton, blaming unspecified "policy" changes amid a Chinese government clampdown on overseas investments. The acquisition would have made Southampton, currently ninth in the Premier League, the latest top-flight English club to gain Chinese investment.

In a statement, Lander Sports implied it was having difficulties completing necessary procedures for the investments, including a corresponding asset restructuring at Lander Sports. "Based on the principle of prudence, the company has decided to terminate this major asset restructuring in order to maintain normal development of the firm's business and safeguard the interest of all investors," said the statement.

The statement was submitted to the stock market in the southern Chinese city of Shenzhen, where Lander Sports is listed. Lander Sports' shares, which were suspended since October as talks with Southampton were under way, resumed trading Monday and tumbled the maximum 10 percent allowed by Chinese stock regulators. Based in eastern China's Zhejiang province, the company said it had signed an agreement in November with club owner Katharina Liebherr for a stake in St Mary's Football Group, Southampton FC's holding company. It gave no details, but talks over a reported £200 million (\$250

million) investment had been ongoing for months. Premier League Manchester City and West Bromwich Albion have received investment from China, while second-tier Aston Villa and Wolverhampton Wanderers have Chinese owners. Chinese enterprises also have taken significant stakes in clubs in Italy, Spain and elsewhere, after the government in recent years encouraged companies to make overseas investments. But it has sharply reversed course lately amid concerns over capital flight, a slumping Chinese currency, and slowing economic growth at home. The government began last year to roll out new restrictions to curb the outflow of money into "irrational" investments.

As a result, outbound investment has plunged so far this year. A \$1 billion bid by China's Wanda Group to buy the US operator of the Golden Globe awards was aborted, the US firm's parent said last year, amid reports that the Chinese investment clampdown was to blame. However, the clampdown did not prevent Serie A giants AC Milan being sold to Rossoneri Sport Investment Lux last week in a deal which saw the Chinese-led consortium take a 99.9 percent stake in the famous Italian club. Under football fan president Xi Jinping, China has ambitions of hosting the World Cup and the country's top companies and richest entrepreneurs have rushed to pick up stakes in foreign clubs and buy foreign players for huge wages.— AFP

AMONG THE EPL ELITES

LONDON: Everton must focus on their own performances and ignore what the clubs around them are doing as they bid to finish among the Premier League's top six, defender Ashley Williams has said. Everton, on 57 points after 33 games, currently occupy sixth spot, three points ahead of Arsenal but having played three more games than the London club. Arsenal are at Middlesbrough later on Monday. "All we can do is look after our own performances. Hopefully we are in that group of teams that are in the mix for those spots," Williams told the club's website. (www.evertonfc.com) "We have a lot of confidence and we are winning a lot of games.

In that top six is where we want to be. "But we know it is a difficult ask to push into that elite group. We are just trying to finish the season as strong as we can and as high as we can." Everton's 3-1 win over Burnley on Saturday was their eighth consecutive home league win. Ross Barkely's shot deflected off Burnley's Ben Mee for Everton's second goal and the midfielder picked up the Man of the Match award. "As players we appreciate how good he is," Williams said. "He has done really well all season and, coming into the club, I have been really impressed. His form has been brilliant." Everton travel to 13th-placed West Ham United on Saturday.— Reuters

BRIGHTON, HOVE ALBION ON BRINK OF PROMOTION

LONDON: Brighton and Hove Albion moved to the brink of promotion to the Premier League as goals from Glenn Murray and Solly March secured a 2-1 win over Wigan Athletic in the Championship yesterday. Second-placed Newcastle United slumped to a 3-1 loss to Ipswich as Brighton fans, sensing a return to the top flight after a 34-year absence, invaded the pitch after the full-time whistle. The win lifted Brighton on to 92 points, seven ahead of Newcastle and 15 clear of Huddersfield Town who meet Derby County in Monday's late kickoff.

If Huddersfield fail to beat Derby, Brighton's promotion will be confirmed. Third-placed Reading kept up the pressure on Newcastle and are now six points behind them after coming from a goal down to beat bottom side Rotherham United 2-1 thanks to second-half strikes from Lewis Grabban and John Swift. Fulham defeated Aston Villa 3-1, taking advantage of Leeds United's 1-0 loss to Wolverhampton Wanderers to climb above them into sixth position and the final playoff spot. Sheffield Wednesday maintained their playoff push and are in fifth place on 75 points, two ahead of Fulham, after a 2-1 win at Queens Park Rangers. —Reuters

AS CHELSEA WOBBLE, CAN SPURS SURGE TO PREMIER LEAGUE TITLE?

MANCHESTER: A four point lead with six games to go. Is the Premier League title race now back on, after so many had assumed Chelsea had the championship in the bag? The fixture list suggests that Chelsea should still be able to finish above challengers Tottenham Hotspur. But strange things can happen when the pressure reaches it's greatest intensity and there was certainly something strange about Chelsea at Old Trafford on Sunday. Manager Antonio Conte certainly struck an unusual tone when addressing the media after Sunday's 2-0 loss to Manchester United, the

club's second defeat in four games. "They showed more desire, more ambition, more motivation. It is very simple but in this case the fault is of the coach. It means the coach was not able to transfer the right concentration, desire, ambition to win this game," he said. Perhaps that was a rare example of a manager taking responsibility for a loss but it could also have been a clever way of admonishing his team for their lack of desire in a game where they failed to produce a single shot on goal.

Why would his players need to be notivated by him at this crucial stage

in the season? Then there were Conte's comments about Saturday's FA Cup semi-final which pits the two London title rivals against each other. "It won't be easy because I think Tottenham now is the best team and they are in good form and they have a lot of enthusiasm. They are feeling the possibility to write the history and it is important to know this," he said.

So, according to Conte, we have a Chelsea side lacking motivation and a Tottenham team that are the best in the country and with a chance of glory. Add in Conte's reminder of how this season should be seen in the context of Chelsea's poor campaign last year and the impression is left of a manager trying to lower expectations just when they are at their highest. Certainly Chelsea don't look like ending the season in peak form and Tottenham are indeed playing some exhilarating and highly effective football. Fixtures list

But a glance at the fixtures list should ease, if not totally dispel, any nerves afflicting the Stamford Bridge faithful. Four of Chelsea's six remaining games are at home, where they have lost just two of 15 games this season. Two of those games are against rele-

gation candidates in Middlesbrough and Sunderland while the others are against beatable mid-table teams in Southampton and Watford. However, the two away games will be more testing-Everton have won eight straight games at home and are brimming with confidence. West Bromwich Albion are eighth and certainly no pushovers at the Hawthornes. Tottenham have just two home games remaining and they are against a United team that are unbeaten in 22 matches and a North London derby against Arsenal, who may be struggling but would love nothing more than to kill their rivals' title hopes.

But Tottenham have a momentum that Chelsea have lost having won their last 12 home games and their manager Mauricio Pochettino certainly isn't worrying about a lack of motivation and desire. A Spurs surge to the title certainly isn't out of the question but as United manager Jose Mourinho put it, when asked about his former club, Chelsea remain favorites. "I think they are in the position where everybody wants to be," he said. "It is better to be in Chelsea position than Tottenham position. That is for sure."— Reuters

Moyes defends credentials

LONDON: Sunderland manager David Moyes defended his credentials as a Premier League match winner after he was jeered by some sections of the home crowd during Saturday's 2-2 draw with West Ham United. Rooted at the bottom of the league with just 21 points from 32 games, Sunderland picked up their first point in four games on Saturday. "It's (the booing) to be expected because me and the team are not doing well," Moyes told the British media. "I have to accept it. "I just remember to myself that I think I have got the third- or fourth-best win record in the Premier League." The Scot was also booed when midfielder Wahbi Khazri, not selected in the starting lineup since October, scored in the first half. Moyes said he was willing to offer more playing time to the 26-year-old Tunisian international if he continued to deliver. "I thought he didn't keep us the ball well enough (before) but I thought he kept the ball well against West Ham, I thought he played in a disciplined fashion as well," Moyes added.

Swansea 'can avoid drop'

SWANSEA: Swansea City believe they can get positive results in their five remaining matches and avoid relegation from the Premier League, midfielder Ki Sung-yueng has said. Swansea, who have conceded the most goals in the league this season, dropped into the relegation zone after a home loss to Tottenham Hotspur and are at 18th spot currently after suffering narrow losses at West Ham United and Watford. "We still believe we can win games, especially when we are playing at home," South Korean Ki told the club's website (www.swanseacity.net). "We have five games to go this season and we still believe in ourselves. "The recent run has been disappointing, but now we have to try to find our confidence and try to get some good results again." Ki believes Saturday's game against Stoke City, who have just one win in their last five league games, provides a great opportunity to get a much-needed win. "If we can get a win against Stoke next weekend, the confidence will be boosted and we will have a chance in the four games after that," he said.

Middlesbrough's survival

LONDON: Middlesbrough can emulate relegationthreatened teams from the past few seasons and go on a winning run in their remaining games to stay in the Premier League, interim manager Steve Agnew said. Middlesbrough are 19th in the table having failed to win a league game since mid-December and are six points adrift of safety with seven games left to play. Leicester City and Sunderland have escaped relegation with late positive runs in recent years. Leicester won seven of their last nine fixtures during the 2014-15 campaign to remain in the league and Sunderland survived last year by avoiding defeat in their last six games. "You can get improbable results and late rallies at this time of the year," Agnew told British media. "It's happened in recent seasons with both Sunderland and Leicester. They have shown that one win can literally change lots of things and it can also affect other teams around you in the table, so that's what we aim to do."

KENYANS SWEEP TITLES AT BOSTON MARATHON

BOSTON: Geoffrey Kirui and Edna Kiplagat Dennis Kimetto in Berlin in 2014. led a Kenyan clean sweep at the 121st Boston Marathon yesterday, both timing late bursts to perfection to claim the men's and women's races of the prestigious event.

Kirui, 24, produced a devastating sprint with four miles to go to settle an enthralling tactical battle with American rival Galen Rupp, the 2016 Olympic bronze medallist.

Kirui waved and smiled as he took the tape in a time of 2hr 9min 37sec, with Rupp finishing in second. It was a masterful performance from the young Kenyan, who made his move with a 4:52 mile at the 22mile mark that saw him pull clear of Rupp. Rupp battled desperately to stay in touch but was unable to respond as Kirui kept the pace up to leave the Oregon-based American in second in 2:09:58. Japan's Suguru Osako was third in 2:10:28.

Kirui's time was well outside the world marathon record of 2:02:57 set by Kenya's

Kirui later revealed he had pulled clear of Rupp after deciding to "test" his own finishing power. "I saw he (Rupp) was a strong guy. Not easy," Kirui said. "So I tried to push a little bit to test myself. And I saw that he had not come with me, so I pushed a little bit more."

Kirui said he now planned to concentrate on marathon running after failing to find success in track events. "I tried many times in the track but I see my future in marathon," he said.

In the women's race, Kiplagat conjured a similarly decisive burst over the closing stages to claim the race for the first time.

The 2011 and 2013 world marathon champion took the tape in 2:21:52 after breaking away from the field with around eight miles to go.

Kiplagat, 37, was greeted by her children and family members as she crossed the line. Rose Chelimo, the Kenyan-born runner who now represents Bahrain, was second in 2:22:51 while Jordan Hasay of the United States was third in 2:23:00. The Kenyan double came as a welcome boost for the East African superpower of long-distance running. Kenyan athletics was left reeling earlier this month after news that Kenva's 2016 Olympic women's marathon champion Jemima Sumgong had failed a drugs test.

Sumgong's drug test was another black eye for Kenyan distance running. Sumgong's former training partner, the 2014 Chicago and Boston Marathon champion Rita Jeptoo, is serving a four-year ban after also testing positive for EPO.

Kenya was last year admonished by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), which accused the country of non-compliance with its anti-doping code. The Boston Marathon is the world's oldest annual marathon and one of the most prestigious races over the distance on the athletics calendar. —AFP

JAMES HARDEN POWERS ROCKETS

BULLS UPSET CELTICS, WARRIORS BEAT TRAIL BLAZERS

WASHINGTON: James Harden scored 37 points as the Houston Rockets routed Russell Westbrook and the Oklahoma City Thunder 118-87 in the opening game of their NBA playoff series on Sunday. Harden outclassed fellow MVP candidate Westbrook also delivering nine assists and seven rebounds for the Rockets who take a 1-0 lead into game two on Wednesday. "Tonight was a good game but it is just one win," Harden said. "We have to be ready to go for Wednesday." Westbrook tallied 22 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists but he also made nine turnovers and missed 17 of 23 shot attempts

Harden and Westbrook are considered the frontrunners in the league MVP race. But Westbrook's individual brilliance doesn't always translate into Thunder victories. The Rockets held Westbrook to just seven points in the second half as they stretched a five point halftime lead to 33 points. As good as Harden was Sunday he also got plenty of help from a strong supporting cast. Patrick Beverley scored a postseason career high 21 points while Nene chipped in 15 points off the bench for Houston. Beverley also shut down Westbrook defensively when it mattered the most.

BULLS 106, CELTICS 102

Jimmy Butler scored 15 of his 30 points in the fourth quarter, including five during an 8-0 run midway through the final period that put Chicago in control, and the Bulls held on to beat the Boston Celtics 106-102 on Sunday in the opener of a first-round Eastern Conference playoff series. Chicago prevailed on an emotional night in Boston, as Celtics point guard Isaiah Thomas played the day after his younger sister, Chyna, was killed in a car crash. Thomas played through tears with "RIP Lil Sis" written in tribute on his shoes. He paced Boston with 33 points. Thomas led a lastgasp effort for the Celtics, hitting a layup with 7.5 seconds left to cut Chicago's lead to 104-102, but Butler dribbled off a few seconds and sealed it with a pair of free throws with 3.3 seconds to go.

WIZARDS 114, HAWKS 107

John Wall had 32 points and 14 assists as Washington controlled the second half to take a 1-0 lead in the series. Bradley Beal scored 22 points and Markieff Morris had 21 points for the Wizards, and Marcin Gortat finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds. Dennis Schroder scored 25 points and Paul Millsap had 19 for the Hawks. Atlanta made 32 of 39 free throws, but only shot 43.6 percent from the field and committed 21 turnovers.

WARRIORS 121, TRAIL BLAZERS 109

Draymond Green led a defensive surge early in the fourth quarter and backup point guard lan Clark contributed seven points to a 15-2 flurry as Golden State won Game 1 of the series.

The eighth-seeded Trail Blazers never trailed by more than eight points in the first three quarters and used a three-point play by backup Pat Connaughton in the final seconds of the third period to draw even at 88-all.— Agencies



STEEL, STIMULUS DRIVE CHINA'S ECONOMIC GROWTH

ANALYSTS SEE GROWTH FADING LATER IN YEAR IF GOVT PUSHES REFORMS

BEIJING: China's economy grew faster than ty in the economy, reached a record 6.93 trillion expected in the first quarter as higher government infrastructure spending and a gravity-defying property boom helped boost industrial output by the most in over two years. Growth of 6.9 percent was the fastest in six quarters, with forecast-beating March investment, retail sales and exports all suggesting the economy may carry solid momentum into spring.

But most analysts say the first quarter may be as good as it gets for China, and worry Beijing is still relying too heavily on stimulus and "old economy" growth drivers, primarily the steel industry and a property market that is overheating. "The Chinese government has a tendency to rely on infrastructure development to sustain growth in the long term," economists at ANZ said in a note. "The question is whether this investment-led model is sustainable as the authorities have trouble taming credit. We need to watch closely whether China's top leadership will send a stronger signal to tighten monetary policy shortly." Even as top officials vowed to crack down on debt risks, China's total social financing, a broad measure of credit and liquidi-

yuan (\$1 trillion) in the quarter-roughly equivalent to the size of Mexico's economy. Spending by the central and local governments rose 21 percent from a year earlier. That helped goose the pace of growth in the first quarter well above the government's 2017 target of around 6.5 percent, and pipped economists' forecasts of 6.8 percent year-on-year.

Such a strong bolt from the gate could see Beijing once again meet its annual growth target, even if activity starts to fade later in the year, as many analysts widely expect.

"Main indicators were better than expected...which laid a good foundation for achieving the full-year growth goals," statistics spokesman Mao Shengyong said at a news conference.

Same old growth drivers?

Once again, China's policymakers leaned on infrastructure and real estate investment to drive expansion. Growth in both areas has accelerated from last year and helped offset slightly weaker growth in the services sector. "Faster growth in industrial output is the primary factor in the first guarter surprise, and due mostly to higher valueadded growth related to supply-side consolidation in heavy industry," said Brian Jackson, China economist at IHS Global Insight.

Fixed asset investment rose 9.2 percent onyear, trouncing estimates, but IHS believes the growth was due entirely to faster spending in industry and construction. Real estate investment remained robust, expanding 9.1 percent, while new construction guickened despite intensifying government measures to cool soaring home prices. Most analysts agree the heated property market poses the single biggest risk to China's growth, but predict the cumulative weight of property curbs will eventually temper activity, not produce an outright crash. "Sales (growth) has started falling, which means tightening measures are starting to take effect," said Shen Jianguang, an analyst at Mizuho Securities in Hong Kong. More than two dozen cities announced property cooling measures in recent weeks, after curbs late last year appeared to have little lasting effect. The construction boom has helped fuel the best profits for China's industrial firms in years, giving them more cash flow to pay down debt or invest in more efficient plants. Buoyed by a near 12 percent increase in housing starts, China produced a record amount of steel in March, Reuters data showed. But analysts say warning signs are flashing.

Rising inventories and recent falls in steel prices suggest output is growing faster than China's demand, raising worries of a glut later in the year, which could heighten trade tensions with the U.S. and other major trading partners. Income growth picks up There were also positive signs on the consumer front. After slowing for five quarters, disposable income growth picked up to 7.0 percent, the fastest since late 2015.

Retail sales rebounded 10.9 percent on-year as consumers shelled out more for appliances and furniture for new homes. Auto sales also showed signs of recovering after weakening early in the year after the government reduced subsidies. Analysts are closely watching for signs that consumption is accounting for a greater share of China's economy, which would make growth more broad based but also reduce the need for more debt-fuelled stimulus and reliance on "smokestack" industries.

Another bright spot was a further rebound in private investment, which had cooled in recent years, leaving the government to bear more of the burden of supporting the economy. Private investment growth accelerated to 7.7 percent.

Though policymakers have pledged repeatedly to push reforms to head off financial risks, the government is keen to keep the economy on an even keel ahead of a major leadership transition later this year. China's central bank has gingerly shifted to a tightening policy bias in recent months, and is using more targeted measures to contain risks after years of ultra-loose settings.

It has nudged up short-term interest rates several times already this year and further modest increases are expected, especially if US rates continue to rise, which could risk a resurgence in capital outflows from China. "I think China should be directing the economy to slow down its growth in the long term...but on the contrary, growth is accelerating," said Hidenobu Tokuda, senior economist at Mizuho Research Institute in Tokyo. "This is good for now but it makes it difficult to see how China's economic slowdown will land in the future. Uncertainties remain high." — Reuters

TELECOM LOBBYING MUSCLE KILLS PRIVACY RULES IN US

NEW YORK: The telecom industry's lobbying muscle pushed a consumer privacy measure to a swift death in Congress. Republicans struck down Obama-era rules that would have imposed tight restrictions on what broadband companies such as Verizon, AT&T and Comcast could do with their customers' personal data. Digital-rights and consumer-advocacy groups such as the Electronic Frontier Foundation supported keeping the rules. But they were outmatched by telecom trade groups and lobbyists.

"These guys spend a fortune in DC, they're very plugged in on the Hill and this was clearly their priority," said Craig Aaron, the president of consumer-advocacy group Free Press.

Former AT&T lobbyist Steve Billet, now on the faculty at George Washington University, said the telecom industry's willingness to spend big on lobbying marks "the difference between them and the Electronic Frontier Foundation guys."

ROLLING IN THE CASH

The overall lobbying tab for telecom services and telephone companies exceeded \$123 million in 2016, the money-influence research group Center for Responsive Politics says. That makes them among the top-spending industries in Washington. By contrast, some of the most active

privacy and consumer groups on the other side spent just over \$1 million, according to the nonpartisan group's data.

The lobbying on both sides goes far beyond privacy. Other issues on the agenda included immigration, taxes, cable boxes and cybersecurity. But the disparity in the spending totals shows that when it comes to politics, industry can wield a lot of power with its pocketbook.

Telecom has also given more in political contributions to the House Republicans who voted to repeal the rules (about \$138,000 on average over their careers) than to the 15 Republicans who voted to keep them (\$77,000), according to the Center for Responsive Politics. In the Senate, the Republicans who voted to undo broadband privacy received more from telecom (\$369,000) than the Democrats who voted to keep the rules (\$329,000). Rep. Marsha Blackburn, R-Tenn, who heads the House subcommittee on communications and technology, received more than \$125,000 from telecom for the 2016 elections, while the ranking Democrat, Mike Doyle of Pennsylvania, got about \$88,000.

In the Senate, Jeff Flake, R.-Ariz., chairman of a privacy and technology subcommittee, received some \$59,000, compared with nearly \$27,000 for the ranking Democrat, Al Franken of Minnesota. To be sure, money does not guarantee a favorable vote. Rep. Steny Hoyer of Maryland, the secondhighest ranking Democrat in the House, received more than \$1.3 million from telecom over his career and nearly \$190,000 for the 2016 election. Yet he joined every other voting Democrat in opposing the industry's repeal efforts.

The repealed rules would have required companies to get customers' permission before offering marketers a wealth of information about them, including health and financial details, geographic location and lists of websites visited and apps used. — AP

US HOMEBUILDER SENTIMENT SLIPS, BUT OUTLOOK POSITIVE

NEW YORK: US homebuilders are feeling slightly less optimistic about their sales prospects, even as their overall outlook remains favorable. The National Association of Home Builders/Wells Fargo builder sentiment index released yesterday slipped to 68 this month. That's down three points from 71 in March, when it jumped to the highest level since June 2005.

Readings above 50 indicate more builders view sales conditions as good rather than poor. The index has been above 60 since September. The April reading fell short of analyst predictions. They expected the index to dip to 70, according to FactSet.

Readings gauging builders' view of sales now and over the next six months also edged lower, as did a measure of traffic by prospective buyers. Despite the decline in the latest builder sentiment survey, sales of new US homes have been robust this year and are expected to continue climbing.

Low mortgage rates and a solid job market have helped drive home sales steadily higher. Sales of new US homes increased in February at the fastest pace since July, reaching a seasonally-adjusted annual rate of 592,000. That sales pace was nearly 13 percent higher than in the same month last year. A pickup in mortgage rates last fall helped spur sales early this




year. In recent weeks, mortgage rates have been edging lower, making the cost of home loans less expensive. The average 30-year fixed mortgage rate has fallen the past four weeks, declining to 4.08 percent last week. That's up from an average of 3.65 percent all last year, but still low by historical standards.


This month's builder index was based on 307 respondents. A measure of current sales conditions for single-family homes fell three points to 74, while a gauge of traffic by prospective buyers declined one point to 52. Builders' view of sales over the next six months slid three points to 75. —AP

KUWAIT LEADS HEALTHY BOND ISSUANCE IN GCC

Yields edge lower in first quarter 2017

KUWAIT: Global yields were range-bound in 1Q17 as markets adjusted to a more optimistic economic outlook and heightened political risk; GCC yields declined on the quarter. Issuance in the GCC was healthy and was led again by sovereigns, with the bulk coming from Kuwait. International issuance remained strong for sovereigns, which helped ease regional liquidity constraints. GCC primary debt market activity is expected to be robust in the coming quarters especially given the need to finance large budget deficits.

Global benchmark 10-year government bonds traded within a 30-40 bps range throughout 1Q17, with the exception of Japanese government bonds. This was despite a Fed move to hike its target rate by 25 bps in March, before earlier expectations. GCC central banks followed suit in support of their USD or quasi-USD pegs, though other major central banks stood pat.

US 10-year Treasuries ended the quarter little changed, only down 3.7 bps, but swung from a low of 2.3 percent on safe haven buys right before Trump's inauguration to a high of 2.6 percent when rising expectations of a March federal funds rate hike fueled a selloff. Yields on US 10-year bonds ended 1Q17 at 2.4 percent. Developments throughout the quarter were mainly driven by Trump's political agenda and his ability to deliver. Recent failures, such as the widely opposed travel ban and the failed attempt at healthcare reform, saw markets revise initially optimistic expectations.

Meanwhile, German government bond (Bund) yields were up on the quarter as a chorus of soft and hard data pointed to a turnaround in eurozone growth, feeding expectations of a sooner rather than later taper of the ECB's QE program. Rate hikes

GCC central banks followed the Fed, raising their policy rates by 25 bps, with Oman being the only exception. The moves were in line with the need to support USD pegs or, in the case of Kuwait, a quasi-USD peg. As for Oman, this is the second time it passes on hiking its rate, despite its peg to the dollar. However, the Central Bank of Oman's repo rate has been rising, effectively pricing in the rate hikes.

GCC issuance was healthy in 1Q17, with sovereigns leading the way as debt financing remains high on the regional debt agenda. Total issuance amounted to \$26 billion in 1Q17, in line with 2016's quarterly average. Sovereigns led the way, with Kuwait issuing half of the \$20 billion government bonds issued. As a result, total outstanding bonds stood at \$381 billion, up 19 percent y/y.

The quarter saw strong international issuance by sovereigns, with Kuwait, Oman, and Bahrain turning to foreign currency debt markets for financing. Kuwait's international issuance was the largest at \$8 billion. It was priced favorably relative to other GCC sovereigns, with the 5-year at 75 bps over equivalent US Treasuries (2.88 percent) and the 10-year at 100 bps over Treasuries (3.62 percent). The spread was below Abu Dhabi's, which until now had been considered the "gold standard" in the GCC. Meanwhile, Oman issued \$5 billion in USD bonds, while Bahrain tapped the market for \$600 million in USD bonds.

GCC foreign debt

Investors are increasingly showing interest in the GCC's foreign debt, not to mention their growing familiarity with the region. Order books have been observed to be 3 to 4 times oversubscribed, reflecting the strong market uncertainties over US economic policy may weigh on GCC yields.

CDS rates are also reflecting investors' confidence in the region, with rates across all GCC sovereigns down between 11 bps (Saudi) and 75 bps (Bahrain) in 1Q17.

The continued pick-up in international issuance is helping control liquidity constraints across the GCC. Saudi Arabia saw the biggest improvement. Its 3-month interbank rate was down 30 bps in 1Q17 and 65 bps following its issuance; this is despite a 50 bps hike in its policy rate . Bahrain, the UAE, and Qatar's 3-month interbank rates were up between 15 bps and 20 bps on the quarter, well below the 50 bps hike in their policy rates.

Private sector issuance was relatively better on the quarter, with the financial sector locking in lower coupons in an environment of rising rates. The financial sector added a 2016 quarter average of \$3.1 billion. Meanwhile, the non-financial sector issued a total of \$1 billion in 1Q17.

GCC debt is expected to remain robust for the rest of 2017, with issuers seeking to take advantage of the still favorable global rate environment supported by improving fiscal sustainability. The GCC's financing needs remain large, estimated at \$90 billion for 2017. Saudi Arabia is looking to issue a sizeable international sukuk, while the quasi-sovereign Saudi Aramco raised \$3 billion in a recent domestic Sukuk issuance as part of large fundraising scheme. Dubai is also considering tapping international debt markets. However, global risks in the form of continued strength in the dollar and a more hawkish Fed, both driven by uncertainties over US economic pol-

BERLIN STARTUP OFFERS A YEAR WITH NO MONEY WORRIES

He is one of 85 people, including around 10 children, chosen by startup Mein Grundeinkommen (My Basic Income) to receive the payments for a year since 2014.

Founder Michael Bohmeyer has set out to prove to a skeptical public in Germany and further afield that the universal basic income (UBI) idea is workable. "Thanks to my first startup, I got a regular income, my life became more creative and healthy. So I wanted to launch a social experiment," 31-yearold Bohmeyer told AFP.

And he wasn't alone in wanting to test the idea, as some 55,000 donors have stumped up the cash for the payments in a "crowdfunding" model-with the final recipients picked out in a "wheel of fortune" event livestreamed online. Mother Birgit Kaulfuss said little Miko "can't really understand, but for the whole family it was exhilarating" when he was chosen-offering a chance to live "in a more relaxed way" and take a firstever family holiday.

Trying things out

"Everyone sleeps more soundly and no one become a layabout," Bohmeyer said of his beneficiaries. Recipients' experiences range from a welcome spell without financial worries to major turning points in their lives. "Without day-to-day pressures, you can be more creative and try things out," Valerie Rupp told public broadcaster ARD in a recent interview. She was able both to take care of her baby and start a career as a decorator-even as her husband, newly arrived from Mali, was taking German lessons. Winners have left jobs that were doing little more for them than put bread on the table to become teachers, taken time out to address chronic illness, broken alcohol addiction, taken care of loved ones, or paid for children's studies.

"It's at once a gift and a prompt" to make a change, explained Astrid Lobeyer, who used the money to give eulogies at funerals and studied the therapeutic Alexander technique, a method for relieving stress in the muscles. Bohmeyer's experiment has fascinated social media and boosted discussion about a universal income in Germany. At the same time, Finland is testing the idea with 2,000 homeless recipients and the idea is a flagship policy for French Socialist presidential candidate Benoit Hamon.

Reward for laziness?

In 2009, the German parliament flatly rejected a petition from some 50,000 Germans demanding a universal income. Nevertheless, some 40 percent of the public still think it's a good idea, according to a survey last June by pollsters Emnid.

Supporters have formed a campaign group called "Buendnis Grundeinkommen" (Basic income federation) with their sights on September's legislative elections, but so far no major party has taken up the cause. There are pockets of support among leftwingers, the right, Catholic organizations and even industry leaders, whose reasoning ranges from fighting poverty to simplifying bureaucracy or smoothing the transition into the digital era. Resistance to the idea is more focused, centering on how UBI would change people's relationship to work.

Right-wingers dismiss it as a "reward for laziness", while the Social Democratic Party (SPD) worried in 2006 about unemployed recipients being "labelled useless" rather than getting help to find jobs. —AFP

LONG, ROUGH RIDE AHEAD FOR 'MADE IN AMERICA'

The rise and fall of US manufacturing sector

RUSTON, Louisiana: Mini motorcycle and gokart maker Monster Moto made a big bet on US manufacturing by moving assembly to this Louisiana town in 2016 from China. But it will be a long ride before it can stamp its products "Made in USA." The loss of nearly one out four US factories in the last two decades means parts for its bike frames and engines must be purchased in China, where the manufacturing supply chain moved years ago.


"There's just no way to source parts in America right now," said Monster Moto Chief Executive Alex Keechle during a tour of the company's assembly plant. "But by planting the flag here, we believe suppliers will follow." Monster Moto's experience is an example of the obstacles American companies face as they, along with President Donald Trump, try to rebuild American manufacturing. U.S. automakers and their suppliers, for example, have already invested billions in plants abroad and would face an expensive and time-consuming transition to buy thousands of American-made parts if President Trump's proposed "border tax" on imported goods were to become law.

When companies reshore assembly to US soil in Monster Moto's case that took two years to find a location and negotiate support from local and state officials - they are betting their demand will create a local supply chain that currently does not exist.

For now, finding US-based suppliers "remains one of the top challenges across our supplier base," said Cindi Marsiglio, Wal-Mart Stores Inc's vice president for US manufacturing and sourcing. Wal-Mart partnered with Monster Moto and several other US companies in a drive to increase spending on American-made goods by \$250 billion by 2023 in response to consumer demand for American-made goods.

Their experience has shown Americans' patriotic shopping habits have limits, namely when it comes to price. Take Monster Moto's bikes, which sell for between \$249 to \$749. Keechle, the CEO, says he can't raise those prices for fear his price sensitive prospective customers will

US DAIRY FARMERS WORRY ABOUT TRADE WITH MEXICO

ST ALBANS, Vt: US dairy farmers already struggling with low milk prices worry President Donald Trump's talk of renegotiating the North American Free Trade Agreement could harm trade to Mexico, its biggest export market.

About 15 percent of dairy production in the United States is exported with onethird valued at \$1.2 billion going to Mexico in the form of milk powder, cheese and whey protein, according to the National Milk Producers Federation, which says trade with Mexico is its top priority. That's nearly double the value exported to Canada, the country's second biggest export market, according to the United States Department of Agriculture.

"The income of dairy farmers, whether they're in Vermont or California, depends heavily on our export to Mexico," said Jaime Castaneda, senior vice president responsible for domestic and international policy for the federation.

If just 1, 2 or 3 percent of the exports were to come back to the United States, "we would see a significant drop on overall prices," he said. Far from the US-Mexican border, trade is on the minds of dairy farmers in Vermont. "Mexico is our biggest desti-

nation for dairy and it's not only dairy," said Fairfield farmer Harold Howrigan Jr, of the US trade partnership with Mexico. "It's corn and soy also that go down there so our huge trading partner and we need that market." Howrigan is the board president of the St Albans Cooperative Creamery. He made comments after meeting with Democratic US Rep. Peter Welch last week.

US dairy trade with Mexico has jumped by 558 percent since NAFTA's implementation in 1994, according to the US Dairy Export Council. Trump last week promised "pleasant surprises" from planned renegotiations of NAFTA, an agreement he's called the worst deal in US history. Trump has said NAFTA puts US workers at a disadvantage.

Anything that happens that reduces the ability to trade products to Mexico will be troubling for dairy producers in the United States, said Scott Brown, a dairy economist with the University of Missouri.

"Can we renegotiate and get a better NAFTA deal? Only time will tell. Those trade agreements traditionally have taken a lot of time and effort to get everybody on the same page and we know we've benefited tremendously on the NAFTA agreement that we have," Brown said. — AP

turn to less expensive rivals made in China.

"Consumers won't give you a free pass just because you put 'Made in USA' on the box," Keechle says. "You have to remain price competitive." Keeping a sharp eye on labor costs in their factory is one thing these US manufactures can control. They see replacing primarily lowerskilled workers on the assembly line with robots on American factory floors as the only way to produce here in a financially viable, cost-competitive way. It's a trend that runs against the narrative candidate Donald Trump used to win the US Presidency.

Since taking office, Trump has continued promises to resurrect US manufacturing's bygone glory days and bring back millions of jobs. On March 31, Trump directed his administration to clamp down on countries that abuse trade rules in a bid to end to the "theft of American prosperity."

But it's more complicated on the ground for companies like Monster Moto. "It's almost as if people think you can just unplug manufacturing in one part of the world and plug it in to the US and everything's going to be fine," said David Abney, Chief Executive Officer of package delivery company United Parcel Service Inc, which helped Monster Moto reconfigure its supply chain to bring its Chinese-made parts to Ruston.

"It's not something that happens overnight," he said. A White House official said that the Trump administration's efforts to encourage manufacturers to reshore production will be focused on cutting regulations and programs to provide new skills to manufacturing workers.

"We recognize that the manufacturing jobs that come back to America might not all look like the ones that left," a White House official said, "and we are taking steps to ensure that the American workforce is ready for that."

Making robots great again

In Monster Moto's cavernous warehouse in Ruston, boxes of imported parts that are delivered at one end then become bikes on a short but industrious assembly line of a few dozen workers. A solitary, long-bearded worker by the name of Billy Mahaffey fires up the bikes to test their engine and brakes before a small group of workers puts them in boxes declaring:

"Assembled in the USA."

Helped by that label, Monster Moto has experienced a recent boom in demand from major customers that include Wal-Mart. The company expects to double production to 80,000 units and increase its assembly workers - who make \$13 to \$15 an hour - to 100 from around 40 in 2017. The most likely components Monster Moto could produce in America first are black, weldedmetal frames for bikes and go-karts, but they would have to automate production because human welders would be too expensive. "We can't just blow up our cost structure," said Monster Moto President Rick Sukkar. "The only way to make it work in America is with robotics."

The same principle applies for much larger manufacturers, such as automotive supplier Delphi Automotive PLC's. Chief Financial Officer Joe Massaro told analysts in February that 90 percent of the company's hourly workforce is in best-cost countries."

When asked about shifting production to the United States from Mexico, Massaro said depending on what happens to trade rules "it would have to be much more of the sort of the automated type manufacturing operations just given — the labor differential there."

That trend is already showing up in data compiled by Economic Policy Institute, a Washington-based think-tank. According to senior economist Rob Scott, not only did America lose 85,000 factories, or 23.5 percent of the total, from 1997 to 2014, but the average number of workers in a U.S. factory declined 14 percent to 44 in 2014 from 1997.

According to Scott, much of the decline in workers was due to automation. "We're going to see more automation in this country because it makes good sense economically for every company," said Hal Sirkin, a managing director at the Boston Consulting Group. "You can spend a lot of time bemoaning it, but that's not going to change."

Manufacturers say automated production requires fewer, but more skilled workers such as robot programmers and operators. The National Association of Manufacturers (NAM) estimates because of the "skills gap" there are 350,000 unfilled manufacturing jobs today in a sector that employs over 12 million people. In Ruston, Mayor Ronny Walker bet on Monster Moto by guaranteeing the company's lease because he wants to diversify the city's economy, and envisions suppliers setting up alongside Monster Moto's assembly plant.

"Could it take a long time to bring manufacturing back here? Sure," he says. "But you have to start somewhere."— Reuters

WALL ST EDGES HIGHER AS **TECH, FINANCIALS GAIN**

NEW YORK: US stocks opened higher yesterday rising for the first time in four days, helped by gains in technology and financial stocks. However, the gains were kept largely in check by rising geopolitical tensions and weak US retail sales data, which was released on Friday.

President Donald Trump's national security adviser said the United States, its allies and China were working on a range of responses to North Korea's latest failed ballistic missile test. The S&P 500 technology sector's 0.44 percent gain provided the biggest boost to the broader index, followed by a 0.3 percent rise in financials. The two sectors had taken a beating last week as investors loaded up on safehavens amid geopolitical worries. Gold prices hit five month highs on Monday, while the dollar fell to a five-month low as the safe yen rose. "The major threat hanging over the market now is the geopolitical situation. The fact that North Korea's failed missile launch maybe a reason why we are seeing a little bit of a bounce back here," said Peter Cardillo, chief market economist at First Standard Financial in New York.

Trading volumes are likely to be light, with most European financial markets closed for the Easter holiday. At 9:41 am ET (1341 GMT), the Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 67 points, or 0.33 percent, at 20,520.25, the S&P 500 was up 5.07 points, or 0.22 percent, at 2,334.02 and the Nasdaq Composite was up 17.33 points, or 0.3 percent, at 5,822.48.

Investors are also keeping an eye on quarterly earnings to justify pricey valuations of stocks. The first quarter is expected to be strong, with earnings of S&P 500 companies estimated to have risen 10.4 percent. Companies set to report results on Monday include Netflix and United Continental, which became a subject of international outrage for dragging a passenger from its plane.

Nine of the 11 major S&P 500 sectors were higher. The healthcare index fell slightly, weighed down by a 10 percent fall in Incyte Corp and a 4 percent drop in Eli Lilly. The US FDA declined to approve a drug for rheumatoid arthritis made by the two companies. Alere jumped 16 percent to \$49.15 after Abbott agreed on Friday to buy the company in a deal valued at about \$5.3 billion. Advancing issues outnumbered decliners on the NYSE by 1,826 to 833. On the Nasdaq, 1,471 issues rose and 860 fell. The S&P 500 index showed four 52-week highs and no lows, while the Nasdaq recorded 13 highs and 11 lows. — Reuters

Asian markets moved cautiously even as Chinese economic growth data beat expectations, with geopolitical concerns weighing on sentiment. China's economy grew 6.9 percent in the first quarter of 2017, government data showed, marking the second quarterly improvement since the final three months of 2014. The reading was better than the median analyst expectation of 6.8 percent in an AFP poll, and up on the fourth quarter figure. But tensions on the Korean peninsula continued to affect markets yesterday as US Vice President Mike Pence warned North Korea not to test President Trump's resolve during a visit to the heavily militarized border between the two Koreas.

Relations between Pyongyang and Washington have reached new lows in recent weeks as a series of North Korean weapons tests have prompted warnings from Trump's administration. Trump last week ordered a naval strike group led by the USS Carl Vinson aircraft carrier to the region, though the vessels remain a long way from the peninsula.

Shanghai fell 0.7 percent, Singapore dropped 0.8 percent while Manila and Jakarta were also down. "China's financial regulation coupled with geopolitical risks surrounding North Korea have heightened risk aversion and put pressure on stocks," Ken Chen, an analyst at KGI Securities Co in Shanghai, told Bloomberg News.

But he added that "the downside should be limited as first-quarter figures showed economic fundamentals remained sound." Yesterday's figures also showed China's industrial output growth rose to 7.6 percent year-on-year in March, beating a Bloomberg estimate of 6.3. The readings follow data showing robust foreign trade and a further expansion in factory activity driven by a pickup in production and demand last month. —Agencies

The new Audi Q2 to make its mark in Kuwait

KUWAIT: Whether on an off-road adventure or for everyday driving in the city - the Audi Q2 is the all-rounder. Sporting a youthful styling and packed with state-of-the-art technology, it made its public debut at the 2016 Geneva International Motor Show and is available at Audi Kuwait showroom represented by Fouad Alghanim & Sons Automotive Company.

At first glance the Q2 already shows its muscles. With broad shoulders and angular styling, it is brimming with energy and confidence. The low roofline and high window line give the sporty car a coupe-like look and a crouching stance on the road. Dollar hits 5-month low vs yen

TOKYO: The dollar dipped to a five-month low against the yen yesterday as rising tensions over North Korea kept the safe-haven Japanese currency in demand. The dollar index against a basket of major currencies was down 0.2 percent at 100.390, weighed down following the release of Friday's weak US retail sales and consumer prices data and as flight-to-safety drove US Treasury yields to five-month lows.

The US currency extended losses from the previous day and retreated to 108.135 yen, its lowest since mid-November. The yen remained broadly bid against other currencies as well. The euro and the pound slid to five-month troughs of 114.955 yen and 136.05 yen, respectively.

Increasing geopolitical risks another notch, North Korea on Sunday made what was believed to be a failed missile test launch. Regional tensions have risen over the past weeks as US President Donald Trump has taken a tough rhetorical line with Pyongyang. "It is unclear whether the situation over North Korea will escalate into military action, but uncertainty is increasing and the dollar continues to edge lower. The dollar also looks shaky technically, after slipping below the 200-day moving average of 108.80 yen," said Masafumi Yamamoto, chief currency strategist at Mizuho Securities in Tokyo.

Japan's proximity to the Korean Peninsula, however, means that the yen's safe-haven status could be eroded if tensions between Washington and Pyongyang escalated into open conflict. "Right now the markets are still functioning, with the reaction to the situation being weaker equities, lower Treasury yields and the yen firming against the dollar," said Koji Fukaya, president at FPG Securities in Tokyo. "But it could be an entirely different matter should an international emergency actually take place," he added, reckoning that the dollar could benefit due to its position as the world's principal reserve currency.

With the bulk of the market's focus on how the standoff between the United States and North Korea will play out, the semi-annual US Treasury currency report released late on Friday did not receive as much attention as some had initially expected. — Reuters

CHINA CAR DILEMMA: BEIJING WANTS ELECTRIC, BUYERS WANT SUVS

Shanghai auto show to showcase work on electric models

BEIJING: Automakers face a dilemma in China's huge but crowded market: Regulators are pushing them to sell electric cars, but buyers want gas-guzzling SUVs. The industry is rattled by Beijing's proposal to require that electric cars make up 8 percent of every brand's production as early as next year. Consumers are steering the other way: First-quarter SUV sales soared 21 percent from a year earlier to 2.4 million, while electric vehicle purchases sank 4.4 percent to just 55,929.

"It's tough for someone with an EV to come and take away market share from SUVs," said Ben Cavender of China Market Research Group. The Shanghai auto show, which opens to the public on Friday, will showcase work on electric models meant to appeal to Chinese drivers who are wary of the unfamiliar technology's reliability and cost. The pressure for electrifiin China is an added headache for automakers at a time when sales growth is slowing and competition heating up in a market they are counting on to drive global revenue. Sales growth fell to 1.7 percent in March from last year's 15 percent. SUVs made up 40 percent of sales, while sedan purchases fell 4.9 percent. At the Shanghai show, the industry's biggest marketing event this year, almost every global and Chinese brand plans to display at least an electric concept car, if not a model ready for sale, alongside its latest SUVs and sedans. General Motors Co.'s Buick unit announced plans last month for Chinese sales of its Velite 5 gasoline-electric hybrid sedan. Buick also sells a hybrid LaCrosse in China.

manufacturer says is a top speed of 194 mph. Volkswagen AG plans to announce its electric vehicle plans for China and unveil an electric concept car. Honda Motor Co. will show its new NeuV, a futuristic concept car the company has suggested might get an electric drive train.

Government planners see electric vehicles as a sector where China can lead, and a Cabinet technology development plan issued in 2013 calls for two of the top global brands in 2025 to be Chinese. Hence the proposal, released in September, calling for electric or gasoline-electric hybrids to make up 8 percent of every automaker's so far is BYD Auto Co. It sells all-electric vehicles to taxi and bus fleets in China and abroad and gasolineelectric hybrid SUVs and sedans to Chinese consumers. BYD Auto says last year's sales rose 70 percent over 2015 to 100,183 vehicles.

That would make it the biggest electric brand for a second year, with Tesla Inc. next at 76,230 vehicles sold. Other Chinese brands offer plug-in electrics but most sold only a few hundred vehicles last year. That is partly because their vehicles cost up to 350,000 yuan (\$50,000), or two to three times the price of equivalent gasoline models. Even Great Wall Motors Ltd., tric cars have," said Zhang Xin, an independent auto industry analyst. To ease such "range anxiety," the Cabinet has ordered the stateowned power industry to step up installation of charging stations.

Government plans call for China to have 100,000 public charging stations and 800,000 private stations by next year, up from a total of 50,000 at the start of 2016. Longer term, the government wants a network that can support 5 million vehicles by 2020. The government also is trying to nudge buyers toward electrics by exempting them from sales taxes and from license plate fees and lotteries imposed by



NEW YORK: Grace Ellis has never known a time when you needed a TV to watch. The North Attleboro, Massachusetts, fifth-grader watches shows like "Liv and Maddie," "Jessie" and "The Lodge" on her laptop, iPad and phone. "Sometimes I watch TV in the car," she says. "I have ballet every day, so I watch on the way." She has a TV in her bedroom that isn't hooked up to cable but is perfect for watching DVDs. And the family's flat-screen has advantages of its own. "It's much bigger," Grace explains, "and on the couch, it's comfier."

Ever since freckle-faced puppet Howdy Doody ushered in children's television nearly 70 years ago, each new generation of viewers has been treated to a growing bounty of programs on a mushrooming selection of gadgetry. But nothing compares to the current wave: "The generation coming up now is used to having everything at their fingertips," says Stacey Lynn Schulman, an analyst at the Katz Media Group. Why not? From birth, theirs has been a world of video digitally issuing from every screen. And for them, any of those screens is just another screen, whether or not you call it "TV." "When they love a (show), they love it in every form and on every platform," says Nickelodeon president Cyma Zarghami. This keeps the bosses at each kid's network scrambling to make sure that wherever children turn their eyes, that network's programming will be there. Even so, it may be surprising that children nonetheless watch most television on, well, a television. As in: old-fashioned linear, whileit's-actually-airing telecasts.

A new Nielsen study finds that in the fourth quarter of 2016, viewers aged 2-11 averaged about 17 hours of live (not timeshifted) TV each week. Granted, that's a drop of about 90 minutes weekly from the year before. But by comparison, kids in fourth quarter 2016 spent about 41/2 hours weekly watching video content on other devices. "Linear TV is still the lion's share of where kids' time is spent," says Jane Gould, senior vice president for consumer insights for Disney Channel. "But it's important for us to be in all the OTHER places where they are, as well."

One reason: Those other outlets can pave the way for a new program's arrival on linear TV. Gould points to "Andi Mack," an ambitious young-adult comedy-drama that debuted on Disney Channel on April 7. Weeks before it landed there, the series could be sampled on digital platforms including the Disney Channel app, Disney.com, Disney Channel YouTube, iTunes, Amazon and Google Play. Count Grace Ellis among the legions of kids whose attention was snagged by this megabuildup. When "Andi Mack" premiered, Grace was one of the 9 million TV viewers who tuned in.—AP

COMPUTER PIONEER ROBERT W TAYLOR DIES AT 85

WOODSIDE, California: Robert W Taylor, who was instrumental in creating the internet and the modern personal computer, has died. He was 85. Taylor, who had Parkinson's disease, died Thursday at his home in the San Francisco Peninsula community of Woodside, his son, Kurt Taylor, told the Los Angeles Times and the New York Times.

In 1961, Taylor was a project manager for NASA when he directed funding to Douglas Engelbart at the Stanford Research Institute, who helped develop the modern computer mouse.

Taylor was working for the Pentagon's Advanced Research Projects Agency in 1966 when he shepherded the creation of a single computer network to link ARPA-sponsored researchers at companies and institutions around the country. Taylor was frustrated that he had to use three separate terminals to communicate with the researchers through their computer systems. ARPANET, as it was known, evolved into the internet. As Taylor predicted, the limited communications tool morphed into a system that supplies people with fingertip access to everything from encyclopedias to investment advice.

A few years later, Taylor went on to work at the Xerox Corp.'s famous Palo Alto Research Center, or PARC, where he was oversaw a team that helped create the Alto, a pioneering personal computer. The Alto supplied each researcher with an individual workstation instead of sharing time on a room-sized mainframe. It was designed to use a graphical user interface, which enabled the user to command the device through icons, windows and menus instead of typing text commands in computer language.

The technology inspired Microsoft's Windows software and the Apple computers. Taylor's engi-

neering team also helped develop the Ethernet and a word processing program that became Microsoft Word. "Any way you look at it, from kick-starting the internet to launching the personal computer revolution, Bob Taylor was a key architect of our modern world," Leslie Berlin, a historian at the Stanford University Silicon Valley Archives project, told the New York Times.

In 1999, Taylor was awarded the National Medal of Technology and Innovation. In 2004, he and other PARC researchers were awarded the Draper Prize from the National Academy of Engineering for development of "the first practical networked personal computers." In the 1990s, Taylor ran the Systems Research Center in Palo Alto for Digital Equipment Corporation. The lab helped create AltaVista, one of the first internet search engines. Taylor retired in 1996. In addition to Kurt, he is survived by his sons Erik and Derek and three grandchildren. —AP

JAPAN VOLCANIC ISLAND MAY HOLD KEY TO CORAL SURVIVAL

JAPAN'S CORALS TO BOLSTER KNOWLEDGE ABOUT MARINE LIFE

ABOARD THE SCHOONER TARA, Japan: The key to the survival of the world's threatened coral reefs may lie in the waters surrounding a small volcanic island off the coast of Japan, scientists say. The seabed of Shikine island is a "living laboratory" for researchers aboard the schooner Tara, a French-led scientific expedition, who are looking for clues to help protect coral from the damaging effects of climate change.

While coral reefs cover less than 0.2 percent of the ocean surface globally, they host some 30 percent of marine animal and plant species, serving as a source of food and offering protection from predators. "Losing these reefs would be horrifying," said Sylvain Agostini, an expedition coordinator and professor at Japan's University of Tsukuba. Shikine's unique conditions-created by underwater volcanoes that flood some of its coves with CO2 and make it less alkaline-mimic what scientists say will be the impact of unchecked carbon emissions on the world's oceans by 2100.

The build-up of CO2 due to greenhouse gas emissions or underwater volcanic activity raises the temperature and transforms the chemistry of ocean waters, in a process known as acidification. Researchers say the waters in parts of Half a dozen researchers on the vessel want to

Shikine, located 160 kilometers south of Tokyo, offer a glimpse of how marine life-including corals can fare in less alkaline water.

Japan's corals, the northernmost in the world, could offer important data to bolster knowledge about marine life, as Australia's Great Barrier Reef faces a threat to its survival.

Last week, scientists said the famous reef was at serious risk from bleaching-a process in which stressed corals expel the algae that live in their tissue and provide them with food-due to warming sea temperatures. They warned that coral bleached for two consecutive years at the World Heritage-listed site had "zero prospect" of recovery after researchers detected another round of mass bleaching after an earlier event in 2016.

Very troubling

"I've been studying corals for 20 years and what I'm seeing is a large-scale decline," Maggy Nugues, a senior lecturer at the prestigious French research institute Ecole Pratique des Hautes Etudes, told AFP aboard the ship, which departed France in May 2016. "There is a 50 percent to 80 percent reduction in coral cover in the Caribbean and the Pacific-this is very troubling."

Built in 1989, the 36-metre long ship has gained fame for previous scientific expeditions, including a 500-day trip in the Arctic, and in 2001 when its former owner, New Zealand skipper Peter Blake, was shot dead on board by pirates in the Amazon.

The current two-year expedition will head to Australia and New Zealand before hitting Indonesia and the Philippines. Nugues warned that the speed of climate change, fuelled by human activity, was making it tough for animals to adapt. "The planet has evolved under relatively stable conditions, letting organisms and animals adapt," she said. "But here we're speeding things up, maybe faster than nature's clock."—AFP

OVERCOMING OPIOIDS: THE QUEST FOR LESS ADDICTIVE DRUGS

Doctors carve from hip to hip, slicing off skin, tightening muscles, tugging at innards. Patients often need strong painkillers for days or even weeks, but Mary Hernandez went home on just over-the-counter ibuprofen. The reason may be the yellowish goo smeared on her 18-inch wound as she lay on the operating table. The Houston woman was helping test a novel medicine aimed at avoiding opioids, potent pain relievers fueling an epidemic of overuse and addiction.

Vicodin, OxyContin and similar drugs are widely used for bad backs, severe arthritis, damaged nerves and other woes. They work powerfully in brain areas that control pleasure and pain, but the body adapts to them quickly, so people need higher and higher doses to get relief. This growing dependence on opioids has mushroomed into a national health crisis, ripping apart communities and straining police and health departments. Every day, an overdose of prescription opioids or heroin kills 91 people, and legions more are brought back from the brink of death.

With some 2 million Americans hooked on these pills, evidence is growing that they're not as good a choice for treating chronic pain as once thought. Drug companies are working on alternatives, but have had little success. Twenty or so years ago, they invested heavily and "failed miserably," said Dr. Nora Volkow, director of the National Institute on Drug Abuse. Pain is a pain to research. Some people bear more than others, and success can't be measured as objectively as it can be with medicines that shrink a tumor or clear an infection. Some new pain drugs that worked well were doomed by side effects - Vioxx, for instance, helped arthritis but hurt hearts.

Some fresh approaches are giving hope: "Bespoke" drugs, as Volkow calls them. These target specific pathways and types of pain rather than acting broadly in the brain. One is Enbrel, which treats a key feature of rheumatoid arthritis and, in the process, eases pain. Drugs to prevent the need for opioids. One that Hernandez was helping test numbs a wound for a few days and curbs inflammation.

If people don't have big pain after surgery, their nerves don't go on high alert and there's less chance of developing chronic pain that might require opioids. Funky new sources for medicines. In testing: Drugs from silk, hot chili peppers and the venom of snakes, snails and other critters. Novel uses for existing drugs. Some seizure and depression medicines, for example, can help some types of pain. The biggest need, however, is for completely new medicines that can be used by lots of people for lots of problems. These also pose the most risk - for companies and patients alike.

One drug's bumpy road

Phyllis Leis in Waterfall, a small town in south-central Pennsylvania, was one."I was so angry," she said. "That was like a miracle drug. It really was. Unless you have arthritis in your knees and have trouble walking, you'll never understand how much relief and what a godsend it was." Her doctor, Alan Kivitz of Altoona Center for Clinical Research, has helped run hundreds of pain studies and consults for Pfizer and many other companies. "You rarely get people to feel that good" as many of them did on the nerve growth factor drugs, he said.

A drug with that much early promise is unusual, said Ken Verburg, who has led Pfizer's pain research for several decades. "When you do see one, you fight hard to try to bring one to the market," he said.

An independent review ultimately tied just a few serious joint problems to tanezumab and the suspension on testing was lifted in August 2012. But a new issue - nervous system effects in some animal studies - prompted a second hold later that year, and that wasn't lifted until 2015. Now Eli Lilly & Co. has joined Pfizer in testing tanezumab in late-stage studies with 7,000 patients. Results are expected late next year - about 17 years after the drug's conception.

Avoiding pain to avoid drugs

What if a drug could keep people from needing long-term pain relief in the first place? Heron Therapeutics Inc. is testing a novel, long-acting version of two drugs - the anesthetic bupivacaine and the anti-inflammatory meloxicam for notoriously painful operations like tummy tucks, bunion removal and hernia repair. Company studies suggest it can numb wounds for about three days and cut patients' need for opioids by 30 to 50 percent.

There's a good chance of preventing brain responses that lead to chronic pain if patients can get through that "initially very rough period," said Dr. Harold Minkowitz, a Houston anesthesiologist who consults for Heron and treated Hernandez in the tummy tuck study. Hernandez was part of an experiment testing the drug versus a placebo and doesn't know whether she got the drug or a dummy medicine. But she hurt less than she expected to and never filled a prescription for pain pills. "The goal would be to have half or more of patients not requiring an opiate after they go home," said Heron's chief executive, Barry Quart. "You have far fewer opiates going out into society, far fewer opiates sitting in medicine cabinets that make their way to a high school." Studies so far are midstage - too small to prove safety and effectiveness - but Heron plans more aimed at winning approval. Many companies have their eyes on sodium channel blockers, which affect how nerves talk to each other and thus might help various types of pain. —AP

TUNIS: A Tunisian zoo that closed after a crocodile was stoned to death has reopened, with extra guards and new signs instructing visitors not to throw things at the animals. The Belvedere Zoo in central Tunis shut its gates in March after a public outcry over the animal's death. Images shared on social media showed the dead crocodile's head beside what appeared to be a bloodied paving slab and another large rock. The reptile's death was the latest in a string of scandals at the 50-year-old zoo, which has long been in need of renovation.

Pictures of the site filled with litter caused an outcry on social media last year. Staff have other complaints. "Some people, when they see a lion sleeping, want to throw a pebble at it to get it up. We ask them to stop," said Taoufik Yaacoubi, a guard at the zoo for 20 years. "It's not normal." Zoo visitors often left rubbish on the ground or threw it into ponds, with some hurling bottles of water into the enclosures. Director Mahmoud Latiri said that before the makeover, "people thought they were in a circus".

He echoed widespread complaints that delinquent behavior had risen in Tunisia since a revolution toppled longtime dictator Zine El Abidine Ben Ali in 2011. "People thought everything was allowed, that was what freedom meant," Latiri said. Environment Minister Riadh Mouakher said videos from the zoo even showed children sitting on the backs of rhinoceroses. Following the crocodile's death, Mouakher decided to deploy extra guards at the zoo, which he said was "in a rather dilapidated state".

"It was more a playground than a zoo," he said. But since the zoo reopened over the weekend following an extensive makeover, he said he had seen an "improvement in behavior". The

authorities have cleaned pools, restored pathways, planted thousands of shrubs and flowers, and installed rubbish bins every five meters. Plastic bags, which are dangerous to animals that eat them, are now banned. New signs instruct visitors not to disturb, feed or throw things at the animals.

"We have a better zoo," Mouakher said. His ministry is hoping to spend a further \$6.5 million

(six million euros) on developing the Belvedere Park surrounding the zoo. School holidays have bumped visitor numbers up to 8,000 a day. This week, families strolled along the pathways in the sunshine. Riadh, accompanied by his wife and daughter, said he could see a definite improvement since the makeover. "Now it is cleaner. You can see that they are looking after it," he said. Now when you pay, you understand why."—AFP

In the early 2000s, a small biotech company had a big idea: blocking nerve growth factor, a protein made in response to pain. The company's drug, now called tanezumab (tah-NAZE-uhmab), works on outlying nerves, helping to keep pain signals from muscles, skin and organs from reaching the spinal cord and brain - good for treating arthritis and bad backs. Pfizer Inc. bought the firm in 2006 and expanded testing. But in 2010, some people on tanezumab and similar drugs being tested by rivals needed joint replacements.

Besides dulling pain, nerve growth factor may affect joint repair and regeneration, so a possible safety issue needed full investigation in a medicine that would be the first of its type ever sold, said one independent expert, Dr. Jianguo Cheng, a Cleveland Clinic pain

ABSENCES, FITNESS, NEW WAYS TO TRACK SCHOOLS

WASHINGTON: How often do students miss school? Are they ready for college? Are they physically fit? Is their school a welcoming place? States are beginning to outline new ways to evaluate their schools, rather than relying just on traditional measures such as test scores. The plans are required under a new federal education law, the Every Student Succeeds Act, which takes effect in the coming school year. Under the new law, states are focusing more on academic growth, meaning not just whether students have achieved a certain academic level in reading and math, but whether they have improved over time.

Mike Petrilli, president of the Thomas B. Fordham Institute, said that's a big change from the No Child Left behind Act, the previous version of the education law. "Schools and educators should feel good about that; that will be a fairer way to measure school quality," he said. But while most experts praised the flexibility and innovation offered by the new law, some think that in the absence of federal guidelines some states may overlook groups of students who need additional support, such as minorities, students with disabilities and English-language learners.

The Republican-controlled Congress moved swiftly this year to rescind key federal accountability guidelines passed by the Obama administration to help states implement the new law. So far, nine states and the District of Columbia have submitted their accountability plans to the Education Department for review, and seven states are completing their blueprints. The remaining states will submit their plans in September. Education Secretary Betsy DeVos will decide whether to accept or reject them.

Climate surveys

She has said her goal is state and local flexibility in education and indicated that she might use the process to advance school choice. When evaluating school quality, states are experimenting with new indicators. Almost all of the first-round states have adopted chronic absenteeism, or how many students miss more than 10 percent of the school year, as a key metric. Connecticut and Delaware, among others, also will be tracking college readiness, or whether high school students are taking advanced classes and how successful they are on college admission tests like the SAT. Tennessee wants to

give every public school in the state a grade from A to F, which state Education Commissioner Candice McQueen says would give parents better information about schools. The grade will take into account such things as how well English language learners are doing and whether disabled students are being served. The schools will also be graded on chronic absenteeism rates, and if students are ready for college or the military and whether traditionally underserved students are performing well. Graduation rates also will count.

Nevada outlined a system that focuses on student growth measures, including test scores, English language proficiency, and graduation rates. Massachusetts will be paying attention to academic results in ninth grade. In New Mexico, the state will begin tracking the need for additional tutoring in college and linking those back to high schools where the students studied. The state also will look at how students do in science in ranking schools. Some states are getting creative. Vermont and Connecticut want to make physical fitness another sign of school quality, while Connecticut also believes access to arts education should be another measure. — AP

BIRD POPULATION IN VERMONT FORESTS DROP 14.2 PERCENT

MONTPELIER: The bird population in Vermont's forests has declined 14.2 percent over 25 years, largely due to several factors, including invasive species, climate change, and the natural cycle of maturing forests, scientists with the Vermont Center for Ecostudies say. The Norwich-based environmental research group says other factors for the decline include acid rain and the fragmentation of forestland caused by humans.

Some bird species that live on flying insects saw the biggest declines, including

the chimney swift, the Eastern phoebe and the tree swallow. But even the more common blue jay saw a 25-percent decline over the survey years between 1989 and 2013. Meanwhile, eight species, including the American robin, pileated woodpecker and mourning dove, increased in population. To protect the birds, the scientists recommend a combination of land conservation and forest management practices.

"For the most part, these are pretty com-

mon and widespread species," said Steven Faccio, the lead author of the report. "We have a lot of forest habitat, but this is a really important time to get an understanding of what's going on with these birds." The study also proved what many bird experts have noticed, especially declines in species that survive by eating flying insects. "This project was started with just that goal in mind, just to track the long term population trends of birds in interior forests," Faccio said.

Allen Strong, associate dean in the Rubenstein School of Environment and Natural Resources at the University of Vermont, said most information about bird populations comes from the North American Breeding Bird survey in which people collect data from roadsides. The Vermont study works in the middle of forests. "These are undistributed forests that we're monitoring here and we're looking at those changes away from roads, away from development, so it's a really different picture," said Strong, who once participated in a forest survey, but was not otherwise involved in the study.

Ken Rosenberg, a scientist at the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, said such longterm studies offer scientists information they would not otherwise have. He noted that some species, apart from the insect eaters, declined over the first decade or so of the study, but they have since stabilized or recovered. "When I look at their data set, I see a lot of stability," he said. The Vermont study was done by comparing results of bird surveys of 125 bird species done by volunteers every June between 1989 and 2013.

It started with 11 survey sites across the state and expanded to 31, all in unmanaged, mature forests from one end of Vermont to the other. The scientists compiling the data looked at the trend estimates for 34 abundant species. It also broke down the study by looking at different species of birds that share similar ecological traits such as foraging style and nesting location, and migration habits.—AP

MADRID: Juan Benito Druet has just learned that his life may be about to change. In the next few hours he will receive a healthy kidney thanks to a pioneering system that has made Spain the world leader in organ transplants for the past 25 years. "We don't know what will happen. But you have to take a chance," said Druet, 63, a reserved and mustachioed boilermaker, as he lies in his bed at Madrid's La Paz hospital.

Hospital staff tries to reassure him by telling him organ transplants are carried out every day in Spain. Doctors performed 4,818 transplants last year, including 2,994 kidney transplants, according to the health ministry's National Transplant Organization (ONT). That means there were 43.4 organ donors per million inhabitants last year, a world record, up from 40.2 donors in 2015.

By comparison in the United States there were just 28.2 donors per million inhabitants in 2015, 28.1 in France and 10.9 in Germany, according to the Council of Europe. "It is even better than if we had won the jackpot in the lottery," says Druet's wife Jeronima, 60, as she sits close to him along with the couple's two adult children. Now she dreams of going on a cruise with her husband, something impossible as long as he needed to be hooked to a 15-kilo (33pound) kidney dialysis machine every night to filter his blood.

of a heart attack or brain death. In both situations kidneys, livers, lungs, pancreas and sometimes even the heart can still work and can be transplanted.

Organ donations are quickly reported to the ONT which searches for the best match from its organ waiting list. If the patient is far away, a cooler with the organ is sent by plane inside the cockpit with the pilot. The operation is free under Spain's public health system, anonymous and available only to residents of the country to avoid organ trafficking.

cian, spent 13 months on dialysis before he received a kidney transplant in 2010. He would previously trek to a hospital three times a week to be hooked up to a machine for three-and-ahalf hours. The kidney transplant "gave me my life back", says Castillo, who now just needs to take pills to ensure his body does not reject the donated kidney.

Empathy and respect

The other secret to the success of the Spanish system is training and communication, explains Matesanz. Since it was set up in 1989, the ONT has trained over 18,000 transplant coordinators who break the news of a person's death and then gently convince their loved ones to agree to donate their organs. Spanish law presumes consent for organs to be removed on their death unless they had previously made clear that they were against donation. But loved ones are systematically consulted.

"You have to have a lot of empathy, sensitivity, respect," says Belen Estebanez, the transplant coordinator at Madrid's La Paz hospital.

Transplant lives

The transplant operation lasts four and half hours. Surgeons make a 15-centimetre incision in Druet's abdomen to transplant a healthy kidney extracted the night before from a woman who died. After a transplant patients "start to regain weight, their health improves. It is as if we transplant lives," the founder of the ONT, Rafael Matesanz, tells AFP.

Matesanz oversaw the implementation of a centralized and well-oiled organ donation and

Centralization

"What makes the difference is the organization of the system. This network, this centralization, is the key," says Marie-Charlotte Bouesseau of the World Health Organization's department of ethics. Worldwide only about 10 percent of all patients who need a transplant receive a donated organ, she adds. "That means that 90 percent will die while they are on a waiting list," she explains. In Spain only four to six percent of patients died in 2016 while they were on a waiting list for a vital organ-a liver, heart or lung.

The work of a transport coordinator was depicted in Spanish director Pedro Almodovar's 1999 Oscar-winning movie "All About My Mother". The director consulted with the ONT to prepare the movie.

"If they have a lot of doubts we ask them what the person was like, if they were generous...from there we get them to reflect on an organ donation," adds Damiana Gurria, another transplant coordinator.

"It comforts many families to know that the organs of their loved ones will live on inside someone else, that people will be thankful for the rest of their lives." Castillo said he drinks two litres of water each day and follows a balanced diet since he received his new kidney. "I have to take care of it, especially since it was given to me. I have to be thankful."-AFP

The early days of drifting competitions were the result of the use of manual brakes and special skills for the drifters of the 1960s, specifically to rugged Japanese mountain roads where a group of contestants competed to break records for every distance separating two points, by crossing the limits of the possibility of tires in harsh turns.

By 1970, drifting had gained widespread popularity as an important part of the prestigious Japan Motor Show. Each drifter was superior to his predecessors, and the drifters demonstrated their tremendous talent in controlling the car more remarkably every year. Twenty years later, the sport has expanded to spread all around the world of motor sports, with countries such as the United Kingdom, Australia, New Zealand and China.



WILKO JOHNSON'S GREAT YEAR

liko Johnson had one of the "greatest years" of his life when he was given 12 months to live. The 69-year-old musician was diagnosed with terminal pancreatic cancer in 2013 and embarked on a farewell tour, and refused to give in to self-pity because he knew everyone's time draws to an end eventually. He said: "That year thinking my life was at an end was one of the greatest years of my life. "The way I handled it was at all times to understand, 'Yes, I'm gonna die' but don't sit there wishing you aren't gonna die because we're all gonna die. I never felt self-pity. I was never in tears all that time... "Looking out at thousands and thousands of people [at Fuji Rock in Japan] and they all know you're gonna die... oh man. I'm gonna die, but it's alright. What a high." The legendary guitarist - whose beloved wife Irene died of cancer in 2004 - defied the odds and overcome the disease following a risky 12-hour operation and admitted it can be "hard" to know he survived where so many others don't. He said: "It's hard to know there are people suffering from cancer who don't survive, and then me. "Why me? It's another proof there is no God, man. Because why is Irene lying in her grave and I'm sitting here talking to you? "She was a wonderful person, a real asset to the world. But that's the way it goes." And Wilko doesn't think he'll ever get over Irene's death. He said recently: "I would look up at the stars and realize that in all the gulfs and light years of the cosmos, she was nowhere to be found. "The moon looked like a cold lump of mud in the sky. "I tell you what. Last night I couldn't sleep. Not an unusual occurrence. But I was in hell. Upstairs just ... I was just thinking, 'What's it all about?' Oh man. "And then of course, thinking about her. It's like a light's gone out of the world ever since then. And I've never got over it."

Ed Sheeran's secret video smash

d Sheeran smashed up a car in his middle of it so we asked if we could use the cousin's debut music video. He explained: "We'd always freestyle jokes, talking about each other's looks and our families and stuff like that - battle-rapping each other - and he'd [Ed] always put on an accent so I'd have to get him back in my raps and he'd play the guitar. These are all happy, funny memories, that's what life is about and that's the good memories I have. 




Stevie Wonder urges expression through music


Motherhood made **Palmer** selective about movie roles



PRINCE HARRY: I SHUT DOWN MY EMOTIONS WHEN MY MOTHER DIED



rince Harry "shut down all his emotions" when his mother Princess Diana died 20 years ago. The 32-year-old royal was just 12 years old when he lost his mother in 1997 after she was tragically killed in a car crash in Paris, France, at the age of 36, and has admitted he almost suffered a "complete breakdown" as he grew up determined not to think about the loss. He said: "I can safely say that losing my mum at the age of 12, and therefore shutting down all of my emotions for the last 20 years, has had a quite serious effect on not only my personal life but my work as well. "I have probably been very close to a complete breakdown on numerous occasions when all sorts of grief and sort of lies and misconceptions and everything are coming to you from every angle." And the Prince - who is the younger brother of Prince William admits he has been in therapy "more than a couple of times" in order to help him deal with his grief, and later turned to boxing as a way to vent his frustrations. He added: "During those years I took up boxing, because everyone was saying boxing is good for you and it's a really good way of letting out aggression. And that really saved me because I was on the verge of punching someone, so being able to punch someone who had pads was certainly easier." Prince Harry claims he refused to talk about his grief at first as he knew it wouldn't bring Princess Diana back, but admits after two years of "total chaos" he started to open up and felt better for doing so. He said: "My way of dealing with it was sticking my head in the sand, refusing to ever think about my mum, because why

would that help? [I thought] it's only going to make you sad, it's not going to bring her back. "So from an emotional side, I was like 'right, don't ever let your emotions be part of anything'. So I was a typical 20, 25, 28-year-old running around going 'life is great', or 'life is fine' and that was exactly it. "And then [I] started to have a few conversations and actually all of a sudden, all of this grief that I have never processed started to come to the forefront and I was like, there is actually a lot of stuff here that I need to deal with." And Harry also credits 34-year-old William with being a "huge support". He said: "It's all about timing. And for me personally, my brother, you know, bless him, he was a huge support to me. He kept saying this is not right, this is not normal, you need to talk to [someone] about stuff, it's OK." Harry is now campaigning to end the stigma surrounding mental health through his charity Heads Together - which he spearheads alongside William and Catherine, Duchess of Cambridge - as he hopes to "make a difference to everybody else". Speaking to Bryony Gordon's 'Mad World' podcast for the Daily Telegraph newspaper, Prince Harry said: "Because of the process I have been through over the past two and a half years, I've now been able to take my work seriously, been able to take my private life seriously as well, and been able to put blood, sweat and tears into the things that really make a difference and things that I think will make a difference to everybody else."

KENDRICK LAMAR, LORDE SHOW NEW SIDES AT COACHELLA

Coachella festival. The two artists, whose last albums each brought Grammy glory, played back-to-back sets to close the first weekend of the premier music festival in the desert of southern California. Lamar has been hailed as an artistic voice of the Black Lives Matter movement but the rapper made an unexpected pivot into the supernatural at Coachella, entering with a fireball as the audience was invited to discover "the legend of Kung Fu Kenny."

The character figures in the lyricism on Lamar's latest album, "DAMN.," which came out Friday. The Coachella crowd learned more about Kung Fu Kenny through a film interspersed in the set showing Lamar as an action hero descended from the mountains. Lamar delved further into eroticized Asian imagery at his show where he danced across a nimble, sword-wielding ninja and the Chinese characters for "the end" flashed on overhead screens. Kung Fu Kenny by the end of the film is said to be searching for a glowing elixir. A grinning Lamar emerges from between a woman's legs-as his kung fu odyssey culminated, apparently, in cunnilingus. Lamar joins a tradition of African American identification with Asian martial arts. The rapper has cited the influence of the Wu-Tang Clan and his film takes on a 1970s "blaxploitation" feel.

Whatever his kung fu aspirations, Lamar hasn't given up the political. He opened both his set and album with a snippet from conservative-leaning Fox News criticizing "Alright," his song of resilience in the face of police brutality. "XXX.," a song off the new album featuring the guitar rock of U2, laments street violence that has claimed too many African American lives yet it also takes to task the political system. "America, god bless you if it's good to you / America, please take my hand,"

Lamar raps in the song, which he debuted live at Coachella. Lamar closed his set melodiously, if anti-cli-mactically, with his new ballad "LOVE."

Lorde shows night out

Lorde, who had not performed for more than two years other than at a small pre-Coachella show in a nearby town, returned with a captivating piece of musical theater-centered around a testing night on the town. After taking the stage to Kate Bush's "Running Up That Hill," the 20-year-old New Zealander stared stoically into space before breaking out into ecstatic dance. Lorde became a breakaway sensation as a teenager with "Royals"-which she dutifully performed-and is coming out with her second album, "Melodrama," in June. Lorde premiered at Coachella another song off "Melodrama"-"Homemade Dynamite," a track that is bouncy but shares the minimalism of "Royals" rather than the elaborate dance production off the new album's first single, "Green Light." The album is about "all the ups and downs of being 20-something, and specifically all the ups and downs of an evening," Lorde told the crowd. She brought the storyline to life through a tableau vivant of sorts-performers inside a foggy box that hovered above the stage. At first the performers mingle amicably but the interaction soon becomes agitated. By the time Lorde enters the box, the troupe is piled up upon one another and later smashes up a room full of balloons.

Special guest

Pulling in up to 250,000 people over back-to-back weekends with identical lineups, Coachella thrives on surprises-which appear quickly on social media and send fans scurrying across the grounds. German film composer Hans Zimmer, one of the more unlikely Coachella acts, pulled in an open-air evening crowd with a piano recital of his scores to movies such as "Pirates of the Caribbean" and "The Lion King." He transitioned into Pharrell Williams' hit "Freedom"which brought the star in himself for a cameo.

Other highlights Sunday included Future Islands, the indie synthpop band whose frontman Samuel T. Herring is a frequent festival draw with his inimitable voice that reaches into a metal-like growl and back.

Spanish indie rockers Hinds enjoyed a surprisingly large crowd with dozens of fans storming the stage in joytaking bassist Ade Martin at face value when she said that Spaniards believed in dancing at gigs.— AFP

Filmmaker learns why she endured airport stops for years

aura Poitras' travel nightmare began more than a decade ago when the award-winning filmmaker started getting detained at airports every time she tried to set foot back in the United States. She was stopped without explanation more than 50 times on foreign travel, and dozens more times on domestic trips, before the extra searches suddenly stopped in 2012. Only now is Poitras beginning to unravel the mystery, which goes back to a bloody day in Baghdad in 2004. Time after time, airport authorities searched her baggage, rummaged through her electronics and quizzed her for hours about her trips.

In Germany, she was told her name lights up "like a Christmas tree" when security officials scan flight rosters. In Austria, she was told her threat score was "400 out of 400." At John F Kennedy International Airport in New York, her laptop, video camera, footage and cell phone were taken and held for 41 days. In Newark, New Jersey, a security officer threatened to handcuff her for taking notes with a ballpoint pen that he said could be used as a weapon. "I asked for crayons because I thought that would be less threatening to him as a weapon," recounted Poitras, whose 2014 documentary film, "Citizenfour," about the National Security Agency leaker Edward Snowden, won an Academy Award. "He denied me any kind of writing device."

Poitras, 53, knows US government officials are not exactly fans of her politically sensitive work. "Citizenfour" depicted Poitras and journalist Glenn Greenwald's rendezvous with Snowden in a Hong Kong hotel where he handed over classified material documenting NSA's widespread surveillance program. Her new film, "Risk," is about WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange. Still, she never knew why the security delays started in 2006. She unsuccessfully sought answers from the Homeland Security Department. She finally took the government to court, filing a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit in 2015 with help from the Electronic Frontier Foundation, a civil liberties advocacy organization.

'White female'

Late last year, as a result of the suit, the government released more than 1,000 pages of documents to Poitras, which she shared with The Associated Press. The documents show for the first time that the US government investigated Poitras on suspicion she might have been involved in an ambush that led to a US soldier's death in Iraq in 2004. On Nov 20, 2004, Poitras was in Baghdad filming "My Country, My Country." The film depicts Iraqi elections from the perspective of an Iraqi doctor, who criticized the US occupation yet hoped democracy would take root in his homeland.

Members of a US Army National Guard unit from Oregon reported seeing a "white female" holding a camera on a rooftop just before they were attacked. David Roustum, 22, an Army National Guardsman from West Seneca, New York, was killed. Several troops were wounded. Some guardsmen who saw Poitras suspected she had a heads-up about the attack and didn't share that information with American forces because she wanted to film it. If true, Poitras would have broken US criminal law. Poitras called the allegation false and said she didn't film the attack. "There is no ambush footage," Poitras told the AP. "That's the narrative that they created, but it doesn't correspond with any facts."

After the attack, a lieutenant colonel, whose name was redacted from documents, reported the woman with a camera to his superiors. No action was taken. But after returning home, the lieutenant colonel was contacted by author John Bruning of Dallas, Oregon, who was interviewing guardsmen for a book about their experiences in Iraq. According to the government's documents, the author learned about the woman filming on the rooftop before the ambush.

Abducted and executed

In an email exchange on Jan 15, 2006, Poitras confirmed to Bruning that she was filming in the area the day of the attack, but didn't think she could help the author with his research. "I was staying in the house of an Iraqi family I was following so my record of the fighting is from the perspective of the family," Poitras wrote to Bruning. "I did not venture out onto the street that day - didn't seem like it would have been a good idea. So I really don't have a document of what took place on the streets."

Bruning told the lieutenant colonel that Poitras was the woman on the rooftop. The lieutenant colonel then informed the US military that she could have been involved. In February 2006, a military police agent from Fort Lewis, Washington, interviewed the lieutenant colonel and the author. Bruning declined to speak to the AP about Poitras. But in his sworn statement to military investigators, he said he believed Poitras had prior knowledge of the attack. He said Poitras was staying in a pro-Saddam Hussein neighborhood "and she was not in fear of her life or being kidnapped at a time when Western journalists were being abducted and executed."

Nevertheless, the Army Criminal Investigation Command at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, wrote a two-page letter shortly after to the FBI, saying the Army lacked sufficient evidence to charge Poitras. It said: "A review by our legal staff of the information developed thus far revealed credible information does not presently exist to believe Ms Poitras committed a criminal offense; however, this could quickly change if Ms. Poitras were to be interviewed and admitted she had knowledge of the ambush and refused to notify US forces in order to further her documentary and media interest."—AP

Residents nervously watch Americas' oldest city gentrifying

atin America's oldest colonial city is aiming for a said Maribel Villalona, the head of the program. The rebound, pouring tens of millions of dollars into repairing streets, cleaning up trash, installing streetlights and renovating centuries-old buildings in hopes of getting more of the Dominican Republic's 5 million tourists a year to spend less time at the beach and more in the capital's long-neglected historic center. Business owners are delighted, but residents of Santo Domingo's walled city are watching nervously, outskirts of the capital. fearful that they will be priced out by a surge of stylish new restaurants and boutiques. "Bringing more tourists here can be traumatic for us," said Pedro del Castillo, the 67-year-old president of the neighborhood's residents' association. "It seems like the aim is for us, the residents, to leave." The city's most ambitious restoration project in decades is funded by a \$120 million loan from the Inter-American Development Bank, most of which still must be approved by the Dominican Republic's congress. The first \$30 million in development monev has gone to paint 800 homes, restore 200 colonial-era facades, replace water mains and street lighting and install new sidewalks. More private business is already moving in, with some 325 new cafes, restaurants, galleries and luxury condominiums opening in the colonial center over the past five surge in tourism. years, according to official figures. The center is "a diamond that needs polishing," said Silvanh Riedel, manager and part-owner of the Billini boutique hotel. Angelo Louis, a 19-year-old barber, rents a 90-square-foot (8.4-square-meter) space without a bathroom in centuries-old El Conde street for \$350 a month, and has to leave because the privately owned building will be restored with public money in coming months. He said he fears that the owner of the remodeled buildings will raise the rent and make it impossible for him to move back. "It's going to hit us hard," he said.

To celebrate the 500th anniversary of Columbus' arrival in the Americas, some of the center's limestone buildings with scenic wooden balconies were restored in 1992, but the program did little to improve the economic fortunes of the area or draw more of the Dominican Republic's tourists. According to government statistics, only 15 percent of visitors to the Dominican Republic spent time in Santo Domingo and only 3 percent slept there, drawn away by all-included packages at beach resorts and dissuaded by the lack of high-quality lodging inside Santo Domingo's walled city. Villalona said the second phase would be aimed at helping poor families in the historic center, restoring some 200 homes and providing their residents with job-training and small-business loans to help them benefit from the expected

Those promises aren't soothing the anxieties of residents like Fidel Perez, a 48-year-old photographer who plans to get married in coming months and says the \$300 or \$400 he can pay for rent would only get him and his wife a single room in the old city, forcing him to look for housing far from the center for the first time in his career. He blames the rising rents on the renovation of the colonial city, and says he's pessimistic that any improvement in the area will benefit its working people. "For now," he said. "We're watching the game from the sidelines."- AP

Officer Ingbert Zacharias told German news outlet hessenschau.de: "The man opened his door in the morning and stood in front of a wall. Trick or joke, we do not know. "This is a crime and not a joke." In total, the estimated damage costs were €500 (£425), as removing the wall also included removing the door frame as well as the bell. And this isn't the first time German pranksters have caused damage in this manner, as a similar practical joke in 2015 caused thousands of pounds worth of damage when the door of a train in Hamburg was bricked up.

Egg-cellent surprise for nursery kids

Children living in Berlin got a real-life kinder surprise. The German North Sea island of Langeoog had a flood of plastic eggs containing tiny toys that were swept ashore after a storm. The eggs, with instructions in the Cyrillic alphabet, appear to have been lost by a cargo ship that was reportedly heading for Bremerhaven, according to The Times newspaper. It is not known how the cargo lost the load but the bounty has brought Easter early to the island. Now a local nursery is tasked with helping collect the toy eggs before it endangers wildlife. According to local media, Langeoog Mayor Uwe Garrels reportedly decided to allow local kindergarten children to collect as many of the eggs - each containing little toys with Russian messages inside - as they wanted. He reportedly told local media: "The surprise eggs have found their way to freedom."
