5-YEAR-OLD GIRL BEATEN TO DEATH BY MOM, LOVER

KUWAIT: A 5-year-old girl was killed by her mother and her boyfriend. Police received a call about a girl who died after falling from a height in Qusour. Detectives and paramedics dispatched to the scene noticed some bruises on the child's body, so they called forensic experts. The body was then referred to the coroner.

When her mother, a divorcee, was questioned, she confessed that she was with her boyfriend. They repeatedly beat the girl because she was disturbing them, leading to her death. The source said the boyfriend took the mother and the girl's body to their car, then the mother went home and called police, claiming the girl had fallen, but bruises on her body indicated otherwise. The mother's boyfriend was arrested at dawn yesterday.

IRBIL: Security authorities in Iraq's Kurdistan have taken measures to ensure safety and stability during the referendum on the region's independence set for Sept 25, 2017. The remarks were made by Kurdish Minister of Interior Karim Sinjari during his meeting with a Kuwaiti media delegation late Sunday. Security authorities have arrested about 1,700 members of the so-called Islamic State (IS) who were hiding among displaced Iraqis in the region's refugee camps, he noted. Although the city of Mosul was liberated from IS' control, there are still some terrorist cells in Mosul that belong to the group, Sinjari said.

The Kuwaiti delegation also met with the head of the foreign affairs department at Kurdistan's government Falah Mustafa, who stressed the importance of boosting cooperation between his region and Kuwait on all levels, mainly investment. Mustafa also addressed the regional and international impact of the upcoming referendum's results.

The Kuwaiti delegation includes KUNA's Editor-in-Chief Saad Al-Ali, Editor-in-Chief of Al-Anbaa daily Yousef Al-Marzouq, Editor-in-Chief of Kuwait Times Abd Al-Rahman Al-Alyan and Trustee of Kuwait Journalists Association Adnan Al-Rashed.

Meanwhile, a Kuwait-funded ward at a prosthetic medical center in Irbil in Iraq's Kurdistan region was launched to treat those whose limbs were amputated in the fight against IS. Speaking on the occasion, head of the center Dr Ghassan Al-Alosy told KUNA that the hospital receives about eight patients of all ages daily, most of them with severed feet or legs. After placing prosthetics, the patients receive physical therapy to allow them to adjust to their new artificial limbs, he noted.

Kuwait rejects 'untrue' Asharq Al-Awsat ban

KUWAIT: Kuwait's Information Ministry yesterday rejected social media rumors that it prevented the distribution of influential UK-based newspaper Asharq Al-Awsat as "untrue and contrary to truth". In a statement, the ministry underlined that it did not ban any of the Saudi private-owned daily's editions in Kuwait. Ministry officials "usually carry out routine procedures for newspapers that arrive in Kuwait from abroad", the statement explained. The ministry's assistant undersecretary for press and publications Khaled Al-Rashidi emphasizes that the newspaper is "being sold across shops and has not been banned".

Turkish troops hold exercises in Qatar

DOHA: Qatar held joint military exercises with Turkish troops yesterday, Qatari media reported, showcasing their strategic alliance two months into a boycott by Arab neighbors which accuse Doha of supporting terrorism. The maneuvers are aimed at preparing Qatar's armed forces to defend "vital economic, strategic and infrastructure facilities," state-owned newspaper Al-Sharq reported.

Saudi billionaire to invest \$800m in Egypt tourism

CAIRO: Saudi Arabian billionaire Prince Alwaleed bin Talal is to invest more than \$800 million in hotels in Egypt, the investment ministry in Cairo said yesterday. The announcement came after parliament in May adopted a new law aimed at attracting foreign investment as the authorities seek to reinvigorate the North African country's struggling economy. The ministry said in a statement that Bin Talal told Investment Minister Sahar Nasr in the Red Sea resort of Sharm El-Sheikh that he would invest in hotels in several locations.

Saudis turn themselves in over attacks: Ministry

RIYADH: Three Saudi Arabians wanted in connection with protests, unrest and attacks on police in the Shiite-majority eastern district of Qatif turned themselves in yesterday, the interior ministry said. The three men were on a "list of 23 fugitives wanted for crimes" in Qatif, the ministry said in a statement carried by the official SPA news agency. The statement also warned that people who "harbor or conceal" any suspects "could face consequences".

Israel to strip Arab attacker of citizenship for first time

JERUSALEM: An Israeli court has decided to strip an Arab Israeli attacker of his citizenship, legal sources said yesterday, in what a rights group said was the first ruling of its kind. The Haifa district court decided to strip Alla Zayud of his citizenship Sunday by applying a 2008 law that allows the interior ministry to deprive of their nationality those involved in "terrorist activities", the sources said. Adalah, an Arab Israeli rights group, said it was the first court decision of its kind. The 22-year-old, from Umm al-Fahm in northern Israel was sentenced to 25 years in jail in June 2016. His mother is an Israeli citizen while his father is a Palestinian with permanent resi-

MORE SYRIAN CHILD BRIDES IN JORDAN AMID POVERTY

MAFRAQ, Jordan: Married at 15 and divorced at 16, a Syrian teen says she regrets having said yes to a handsome suitor - a stranger who turned into an abusive husband. Yet the reasons that transformed her into a child bride have become more prevalent among Syrians who live in Jordanian exile because of a six-year-old civil war back home. More families marry off daughters to ease the financial burden or say marriage is the way to protect the "honor" of girls seen as vulnerable outside their homeland.

Figures from Jordan's population census document the long suspected increase for the first time. In 2015, brides between the ages of 13 and 17 made up almost 44 percent of all Syrian females in Jordan getting married that year, compared to 33 percent in 2010. With Syrians expected to remain in exile for years, it's a harmful trend for refugees and their overburdened host

country, UN and Jordanian officials say.

More Syrian girls will lose out on education, since most child brides drop out of school. They typically marry fellow Syrians who are just a few years older, often without a steady job - a constellation that helps perpetuate poverty. And they will likely have more children than those who marry as adults, driving up Jordan's fertility rate. "This means we will have more people, more than the government of Jordan can afford," said Maysoon Al-Zoabi, secretary general of Jordan's Higher Population Council.

The figures on early marriage were drawn from Jordan's Nov 2015 census and compiled in a new study. The census counted 9.5 million people living in Jordan, including 2.9 million non-Jordanians. Among the foreigners were 1.265 million Syrians - or double the number of refugees

RAMALLAH: Jordan's King Abdullah II offered support to Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas during a rare visit yesterday to the occupied West Bank following tensions with Israel over a flashpoint Jerusalem holy site. Abdullah's first trip to the West Bank in five years was seen as a message to Israel and the United States over the sensitive Al-Aqsa mosque compound and the stalled peace process. It came less than two weeks after the end of a standoff at the holy site over new security measures, including metal detectors, imposed by Israel following an attack that killed two policemen.

Abdullah stressed to Abbas "the full Jordanian support for the legitimate rights of its brothers the Palestinian people and support for the establishment of an independent Palestinian state with its capital in east Jerusalem", a statement from Jordan's royal palace said. He backed the need to protect Jerusalem's Al-Aqsa mosque compound, warning Israeli attempts to change the status quo - under which Jordan is custodian of the site and Jewish prayer is forbidden - "would have negative consequences for the whole region".

The Al-Aqsa compound is also holy to

Jews, who refer to it as the Temple Mount as it is believed to be on the site of the first and second Jewish Temples, the latter of which was destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. Abdullah also "called for the commitment of US President Donald Trump to work to realise peace between Palestinians and Israelis". The king flew by helicopter to Ramallah and a red carpet welcome from Abbas. He returned to Jordan after a meeting that lasted around an hour and a half. The king did not meet any Israeli officials.

Jordan reacted angrily last month to the new security measures at the mosque compound, which sparked several days of protests and clashes in Jerusalem's Old City, the occupied West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Palestinian foreign minister Riyad Al-Malki told reporters that Abbas and Abdullah yesterday discussed "direct Israeli attacks on the Al-Aqsa mosque". Tensions were exacerbated on July 23 when an Israeli security guard shot dead two Jordanians at the Israeli embassy compound in Amman. One of the two men attacked the Israeli with a screwdriver, and the other was apparently shot dead by accident, Israeli officials said.

ALGERIA REITERATES SUPPORT TO AMIR'S GULF EFFORTS

KUWAIT: Algeria has reaffirmed support to the ongoing mediation efforts led by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah to end the Gulf crisis. During a meeting with His Highness the Amir yesterday, the visiting Algerian Foreign Minister Abdulqader Musahel said he delivered a "strong message" on Algeria's support to Kuwait's efforts to "reunite the brothers in the GCC." It is a message of backing to His Highness the Amir's initiative, Musahel said, noting that the Algerians are optimistic about Sheikh Sabah's success in the mission thanks to his experience and sagacity, as "a man of peace."

"(Arabs) are now in more dire need than ever to reunite and cooperate," amid the crises in Syria, Libya, Iraq and Yemen, "to speak in one voice and defend our interests, as we own the will and the capabilities to solve our problems on our own, no need for foreign interference," he said in a press statement. He stressed that Algeria and Kuwait share a policy of refraining from interfering in others' affairs, as "we accept no interference in ours."

Meanwhile, Musahel said he had handed His Highness the Amir a letter from President Abdelaziz Bouteflika, on bilateral ties the latest regional and international developments. The Algerian chief diplomat noted that he benefited a lot from His Highness the Amir's analysis,

either on the distinguished bilateral ties or the developments on the Arab scene.

He said that he also reiterated Algeria's readiness to "deepen and broaden bilateral cooperation" and to carry on with consultations on issues of common concern, both on the events in the Arab region or on the threats to the two countries' peace and security, with violent extremism and terrorism on top.

Earlier yesterday, His Highness the Prime

Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah received the Algerian Minister of Foreign Affairs, in presence of First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah. The meeting was attended by Director of His Highness the Prime Minister's Diwan Sheikhha Etemad Al-Khaled Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, Assistant Foreign Minister and Office Director for the First Deputy Premier and Foreign Minister Ambassador Dr

Sheikh Ahmad Nasser Al-Mohammad Al-Sabah and Assistant Foreign Minister for the Arab World Affairs Ambassador Aziz Al-Daihani.

On Sunday, Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled and his Algerian counterpart discussed means of enhancing bilateral relations, as well as the latest developments on both regional and international arenas. The meeting was attended by Deputy Foreign Minister Khaled Al-Jarallah, Assistant Foreign Minister for the First Deputy

Kuwait's Al-Najat Charity provided donations to treat over 100 Iraqis in need of artificial limbs at the center.

Sinjari noted that his region received over 35,000 injured people during the battle of Mosul. Due to the large numbers of those in need for medical care, hospitals suffered a shortage of necessary items and medicines, especially anesthesia to perform surgeries, he explained. The official added that Kuwait immediately sent medical aid to face the growing numbers of patients.

The inauguration was attended by members of the Kuwaiti media delegation. Kuwait is continuously providing medical aid to displaced Iraqis in Irbil, sending medicines, medical equipment and ambulances. The country also funded the establishment of five medical centers in camps inside Irbil and Dohuk. Moreover, Kuwait funded the treatment of over 500 Iraqis who needed different surgeries. — KUNA

CABINET PRODS MEDIA'S ROLE IN NATIONAL UNITY PROTECTION

NOD TO GCC VALUE ADDED TAX

KUWAIT: The Kuwaiti Cabinet yesterday called on local mass media to live up to their due national responsibilities by helping in protecting and safeguarding national unity. The call came during the cabinet's routine weekly meeting held at Bayan Palace under chairmanship of His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah.

The cabinet attacked mass media to fend off reporting anything that could trigger off tensions or divisions in the society, Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs and Acting Minister of Information Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah said in a statement following the meeting.

However, the cabinet applauded the sincere efforts of the Interior Ministry and its personnel to safeguard national security, safety and stability, along with their security measures nationwide to collar those convicted in the Al-Abdali terror cell, the minister said.

Kuwaiti citizens and residents were also urged to work with the Interior Ministry in its efforts to thwart any bid to undermine the country's security and stability amid the critical regional circumstances, Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah added.

Amir's delegation

At the onset of the meeting, the cabinet was notified of the delegation that will accompany His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah during his official visit to Washington on September 6. The delegation includes Deputy Chief of the Kuwait National Guard Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior Sheikh Khaled Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah, and Deputy Prime Minister

and Minister of Finance Anas Al-Saleh, in addition to senior officials of the Amiri Diwan, and other relevant bodies. Security and a media teams are also included.

Then, First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah briefed the ministers on the outcome of the recent visit to Kuwait by Minister in Charge of Foreign Affairs in Oman Dr Yusuf Bin Alawi. During the visit, the Omani minister held talks with His Highness the Amir on Kuwait's mediation efforts to contain and solve the Gulf crisis, besides the

latest relevant developments, in addition to bilateral fraternal ties.

Meanwhile, the ministers approved a draft bill, one allowing the government to conduct public loans and financing from the local and the international markets, with the aim of issuing the tools of public after October 2017, the time set by the present law. Another draft bill was also approved on amending Article 29 of the of Law 32 of 1967 regarding the army.

Value Added Tax

Also today, the cabinet gave the thumbs up to draft bills approving the

GCC Unified Selective Excise Tax, the GCC unified Value Added Tax (VAT) and the statute of the GCC Economic Judiciary Commission.

The ministers consented draft bills approving a legal and judicial agreement regarding the civil, commercial, personal status and penal articles with Egypt, and protocols for amending two accords to avoid tax evasion and double taxation on income with India and Brunei.

The cabinet also approved a draft bill on a memorandum of understanding (MoU) on security cooperation with Iraq. All the draft bills approved

yesterday have been referred to His Highness the Amir, to find their way later to the National Assembly.

The ministers approved a draft decree on two protocols for amending Articles 50 A and 56 of the Convention on International Civil Aviation signed in October 2016. They also approved other draft decrees on a host of cooperation MoUs and agreements with some world countries.

These include a MoU for cooperation in Islamic affairs with Turkey; an agreement for technical and cultural cooperation with Malta; two MoUs on countering financing of terrorism, and cooperation in higher education and scientific research with Brunei; an economic and technical cooperation agreement with Slovakia; a MoU for cooperation in water management with Hungary; an economic and technical cooperation agreement with Albania's government; and finally an agreement on air services with Belize. All the draft bills have been referred to His Highness the Amir, to be later sent to the National Assembly. Concluding the weekly routine meeting, the cabinet reviewed the political developments on the Arab and international scenes. —KUNA

MAN ARRESTED WITH DRUGS IN AHMADI HOME

KUWAIT: Drugs Control General Department arrested a citizen with seven kilograms of marijuana. Tips were received about the man trading in drugs, so investigations were conducted and he was arrested in his Ahmadi home. He confessed the drugs belonged to him and he traded in it.

Traffic

The traffic department carried out several traffic campaigns in all governorates from July 23 till July 29, resulting in issuing 32,555 citations, impounding 1,052 vehicles and two motorbikes and arresting 64 persons, while five expats were sent for deportation for driving without a license.



KUWAIT: Kuwait Municipality's public relations department said Hawally municipality inspection and municipal services follow-up department carried out a campaign resulting in issuing 44 citations for various food-related violations, operating without a health certificate and commencing activities prior to municipality approval. PUBLIC SECTOR REMAINS MOST ATTRACTIVE FOR CITIZENS: MINISTER

KUWAIT: Social Affairs Minister Hind Al-Sabeeh said that economic circumstances that accompanied the drop in oil prices and the large gap in incentives between the public and private sectors have increased demand to work in the public sector. She said in an answer to a parliamentary question that the Jaber Al-Ahmad Hospital is on the 2016/2017 annual plan as construction work extended beyond the 2015/2016 annual plan. Sabeeh said the development plan aims at creating 6,601 additional jobs, which was not totally fulfilled due to the economic circumstances.

Meanwhile, MP Khalid Al-Otaibi expressed regret over developments at the Social Affairs Ministry, adding that the minister is taking the ministry from bad to worse. He rejected the central policy and reducing officials' authorities. "We warned against the presence of

non-cooperative ministers," the lawmaker said, and asked for a wide-ranging government change so that ministers' performance is up to the ambitions of MPs and the people. He said he rejected the minister's policy at the disabled authority with regards to 'humiliating citizens' and malicious action towards

their rights. Furthermore, he accused the minister of still wanting to harm unions and deliberately stopped approvals of unions and interfered in their work, forcing them to resort to the judiciary.

4,000 bedoons
Parliamentary sources said the

law to naturalize 4,000 bedoons at the interior and defense committee will not be of top priority at the start of the next parliamentary term. Sources said the committee told MPs that its stand has not changed, which means the law will not pass without government approval.

Ministry's support

Assistant undersecretary for the television sector at the information ministry Majeed Al-Jazzaf said the ministry has approved a future plan to develop the human element "administratively, technically and financially" and upgrade systems. He said that more than 2,250 employees at the sector enjoy the ministry's support and more than 90 percent of programs were reduced from 90 to 30 minutes to avoid burdening them. He said that 1,200 contracted employees were terminated to rely on ministry employees.

KFSD DENIES FIRE ENGINE USED IN IS VIDEO

KUWAIT: Kuwait Fire Service Directorate (KFSD) denied rumors speculating that one of its vehicles appeared in a video clip posted recently online by the Islamic State (IS) terrorist group. KFSD explained in a statement yesterday that all of its vehicles are closely monitored and their movements are known and recorded. It said that legal action has been taken to arrest the person behind spreading the rumors.

KUWAIT: His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah sent a congratulatory cable yesterday to newly-appointed Pakistani Prime Minister Shahid Khaqan Abbasi after being constitutionally sworn in. ‘NETUREI KARTA’

I saw a TV report about an extreme Jewish movement called ‘Neturei Karta’ (city guardians), and the word Natoor is mentioned with the same pronunciation in Hebrew. The similarity between the Arab and Hebrew pronunciations in the word ‘natoor’ leads me to remembering a short period in which I studied Hebrew and found a similarity in some vocabulary between it and Arabic. I still remember little Hebrew, as much of what I learned nearly 40 years ago has been lost with time. I am not here to speak about the similarities between Arabic and Hebrew, but I wanted to focus on that Jewish movement which I started my article speaking about it: ‘Neturei Karta.’

This movement or organization is very strange. It is a thorny plant in Israel as it acts against Zionism, and does not recognize

Israel. Rather, it opposes the establishment of the state of Israel because it sees Judaism as a religion, not a state, and that it is not right to establish a political entity based on religious Jewish justifications. This movement believes that the Jewish religion should be kept away from the political mud, and that is why it has more animosity towards Zionism and Israel than the Palestinians themselves and the entire Arabs and Muslims. Why? Because they see that Israel stabbed them in the back and harmed their religion.

Yet, the Israeli government considers them as traitors, and that is why it suppresses them worse than it does the Palestinians. Despite their continued clashes with the Israeli force, they do not let any occasion go without anti-Israel demonstrations; during which they carry the Palestinian flag and desecrate the Israeli flag. They are friends of Muslims and Christians and do not consider the Zionists as Jews, but they consider them intruders on Judaism. They look at themselves as Palestinian Jews and are demanding a Palestinian ruling of Israel. Some of them spoke about what they face in the form of Israeli oppression, but despite that, they are holding on their ideology and principles.

HOW DID THEY TURN HUMILIATION INTO POWER?

On June 12th 1941, Japan attacked Pearl Harbor in order to weaken the American Navy fleet, and to ensure its control over its neighboring countries. Then in August 1945, the American Air force dropped two nuclear bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki respectively, claiming that the Japanese prefer suicide over surrender. On August 14, 1945 Emperor Hirohito declared Japan's surrender saying that it was for the sake of Japan and its people. The capitulation was signed in September 1945, which was changed into an alliance and protection treaty in 1951.

General Douglas MacArthur placed his command headquarters opposite to the Imperial Palace, and made decisions to humiliate Japan, the emperor and the people. He supervised the writing of Japan's constitution which came in effect in the year 1946. The authorities of the emperor were given to the Prime Minister. Article 9 banned Japan from forming an army and Japan bowed to American demands, but on the other hand, it paid attention to halting its economic collapse through a plan known as the Yoshida Doctrine, after Prime Minister Shigeru Yoshida who served from 1946 to 1954.

American capitals were encouraged to invest in the Japanese industry. But after the revival of this economy, the Japanese were able to take over all shares of foreign companies. Following marathon negotiations, Japan agreed at the end of the 1970s to allow foreigners to have 20 percent in Japanese firms, provided that the number of shareholders must be at least five people in each company. The goal behind that is to keep them from influencing the decision making process (divide and conquer).

There are many Americans bases in Japan, and the Japanese are convinced that it is necessary for them to be there because it forms a security protection against any foreign aggression. The American Ambassador said during a lecture in the foreign Journalists club in 1982: "The Japanese economy is at its peak, so we hope that Japan contributes to the budget of renovating the (military) bases." Then on the next day, a Japanese statement said that Article 9 of the constitution that was written by General MacArthur does not allow Japan to deal with military affairs.

When the Americans asked for the amendment of the constitution, the Japanese answer was: the opposition in the Parliament will not agree. Japan took advantage of the American free trade policy, and was exporting 1.8 million vehicles a year to America in addition to other products, but there was not a single American product in its markets. This reflects Japan's wisdom with which they turned the tables on General MacArthur, and turned humiliation into an industrial and economic power. American forces could not influence change to Japan's policy.

It has been said that after signing the merger agreement between Egypt and Syria, Syrian President Shukri Al-Quwatly told Egyptian President Jamal Abdunnasser "the population of Syria is seven million, which means I gave you seven million leaders." Individuality and the leadership in an Arab person makes it easy for conspiracies to multiply, and that is why it is said that Arabs always agree to disagree.

THE ‘LOST GENERATION’ OF MIDDLE EAST MEN

WAR, VIOLENCE AND TURMOIL AFFECTING MEN IN PARTICULAR

MIAMI: Suicide and murder take 10 times as many lives as war does in the Middle East and nearby regions, creating a “lost generation,” particularly among men, researchers said yesterday. These violent acts accounted for 1.4 million deaths in 2015 in the Eastern Mediterranean region, which includes 22 nations such as Afghanistan, Iran, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and the United Arab Emirates, said the report in the International Journal of Public Health.

Wars in the Eastern Mediterranean region-home to 600 million people-took an addi-

tional 144,000 lives. “Intractable and endemic violence is creating a lost generation of children and young adults,” said lead author Ali Mokdad, director for Middle Eastern Initiatives at the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at the University of Washington. “The future of the Middle East is grim unless we can find a way to bring stability to the region.”

Researchers also found a “sharp increase” in mental health conditions such as depression, anxiety, bipolar disorder, and schizophrenia in the Eastern Mediterranean. “In

2015, nearly 30,000 people in the region committed suicide and another 35,000 died from interpersonal violence, representing increases of 100 percent and 152 percent, respectively, over the past 25 years,” said the report. “In other parts of the world during the same period, the number of deaths from suicide increased 19 percent and interpersonal violence by 12 percent.”

Shortage of experts

Meanwhile, experts such as counselors, psychiatrists and psychologists are in severe

shortage. Countries such as Libya, Sudan and Yemen have just 0.5 psychiatrists per 100,000 people, said the report. In comparison, among European nations the ratio ranges from nine per 100,000 to more than 40. Researchers also found a 10-fold increase in deaths related to HIV/AIDS between 1990 and 2015.

Most of the cases of death from HIV/AIDS occurred in Djibouti, Somalia, and Sudan. “In this region, individuals infected with HIV are dying faster than the rest of the world,” said assistant professor at IHME, Charbel El

Bcheraoui. “This is a sign that HIV patients are not receiving proper treatment in an era where HIV can be well controlled with the appropriate treatment regimens.” The entire report includes 15 papers and three editorials. The data comes from the most recent estimates from the annual Global Burden of Diseases, Injuries, and Risk Factors study (GBD). The GBD is put together by more than 2,300 collaborators in 132 countries, and looks at health loss from all major diseases, injuries, and risk factors by age, sex, and population. — AFP

TRUMP STILL HUNTING FOR COMMUNICATIONS CHIEF

NEW YORK: For the third time in six months, President Donald Trump is on the hunt for a new communications director. But in practice, the job is filled. It's Trump who's the White House's leading expert and the final word on what and how he communicates with the public. Despite decrying most negative media coverage as “fake news” and personally insulting members of the media, he has inserted himself into the White House's press operations in an unprecedented fashion for a president.

Trump has dictated news releases and pushed those who speak for him to bend the facts to bolster his claims. He has ignored the advice of his legal team and thrown out carefully planned legislative strategies with a single 140-character tweet. His direct, hands-on style helped him win the White House and still thrills his supporters. It also, however, poses increasing political and potentially legal risks. The clearest example is his involvement in crafting a statement for son Donald Jr. about a meeting with a Kremlin-connected lawyer. That declaration was quickly proven erroneous and raised questions about whether the president was trying to cover for his son.

Trump has struggled to find a communications adviser that meets his approval. His first, Mike Dubke, stayed behind the scenes and never clicked with Trump, leaving after three months. Then Sean Spicer, Trump's oft-beleaguered press secretary, took on the communications director job as well. He resigned both posts last month when Trump brought in hard-charging New York financier Anthony Scaramucci. Scaramucci lasted only 11 days before being fired in the aftermath

of an expletive-filled interview. A fourth candidate for the post, campaign spokesman Jason Miller, was named to the job during the transition but turned it down days later, citing a need to spend time with his family.

Private talks

More recently there have been some informal internal conversations about an increased communications role for White House aide Stephen Miller, according to an administration official who was not authorized to discuss private talks by

name and requested anonymity. Those talks are still seen as preliminary. Miller recently clashed with some reporters over immigration policy at a contentious press briefing.

This past week, as White House staffers readied a statement accompanying Trump's signature on legislation approving toughened sanctions on Russia - a bill Trump criticized - word came down that the president wanted to add some off-topic language into the statement. That's according to two officials familiar with the matter who spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to publicly talk about internal discussions.

“I built a truly great company worth many billions of dollars,” the new section read. “That is a big part of the reason I was elected. As president, I can make far better deals with foreign countries than Congress.” That personal and boastful rhetoric is a far cry from the formal language normally found in presidential statements. It also appeared aimed at angering the same lawmakers he will need if he wants to pass any major legislation.

“All presidents are their own best messengers,” said Ari Fleischer, a press secretary for President George W. Bush. Fleischer said that Bush, too, would at times get involved with the White House press shop. Fleischer noted there was always a safety net of advisers at work. That does not appear to exist around the current president - particular around his Twitter account. “The lesson for this president is that it's perfectly fine to be involved and to, at times, go around the mainstream media with Twitter,” Fleischer said. “But he needs to tweet smarter.” — AP

TALEBAN, IS JOINTLY MASSACRED 50 CIVILIANS: AFGHAN OFFICIALS

KABUL: The Taliban and Islamic State group jointly massacred dozens of civilians in an Afghan village, officials said yesterday, highlighting rare co-operation between the insurgents that could increase the strain on Afghanistan's beleaguered security forces. The fighters killed more than 50 men, women and children in the remote Sayad district of northern Sar-e Pul province on Saturday after overrunning the Afghan Local Police (ALP) — a government-backed militia-in a 48-hour battle, according to local officials.

“It was a joint operation by Daesh (IS) and Taliban fighters. They had recruited forces from other provinces of the country and attacked Mirzawalang village,” Zabihullah Amani, a spokesman for the provincial governor, told AFP. The spokesman alleged that dozens of Taliban and IS group fighters under the command of Sher Mohammad Ghazanfar, a local Taliban commander who Amani claims pledged allegiance to IS, launched a coordinated attack on the area on Thursday.

“The fighters overran the area and it led to the massacre of innocent and defenceless civilians,” he said. The majority of those killed were Shiites. Most were shot but some were beheaded, Amani added. Verifying information from poor, mountainous areas of Afghanistan made inaccessible by fighting and with patchy communications is difficult, and AFP was not able to access the village.

Mohammad Noor Rahmani, head of Sar-e Pul's provincial council, said 44 of the 50

victims were believed to be civilians, with the ALP militia also suffering casualties. “This is not the final toll. It might change because the area is inaccessible and no telephone networks are working to get an update,” he told AFP. The Taliban and IS fighters have regularly clashed since the latter gained a foothold in eastern Afghanistan in 2015, as the two vie for supremacy in the war-torn country.

An Afghan security source told AFP there had been around three incidents in the past where fighters from both groups had teamed up to strike Afghan forces in certain areas. “This is not the first time that they have co-operated. There are no strict ideological distinctions between them so they build bridges when it helps them both. It's very opportunistic,” the source said.

IS has been adding a sectarian twist to the Afghan conflict, with a number of deadly attacks on Shiites in the past year. Last week two suicide bombers throwing grenades killed more than 33 worshippers at a mosque in Afghanistan's western city of Herat, in an attack claimed by IS. A resurgent Taliban, whose ranks are mostly made up of Sunni Muslim ethnic Pashtuns, is at the peak of its summer fighting season.

Zabihullah Mujahid, a spokesman for the Taliban, confirmed to AFP that it had captured Mirzawalang village but said it had done so alone. It also denied allegations it had killed civilians. “It was an independent operation by our mujahideen forces. There is no cooperation with the Islamic State on the operation,” said the spokesman. — AFP

PENCE: STORY ON POSSIBLE 2020 PRESIDENTIAL RUN ‘DISGRACEFUL’

BRIDGEWATER: Vice President Mike Pence has pushed back against a news report suggesting he is laying groundwork for a possible presidential bid in 2020 if President Donald Trump does not run. In a statement released by the White House, Pence said Sunday's story in The New York Times "is disgraceful and offensive to me, my family, and our entire team." He added that "the allegations in this article are categorically false." The formal rebuttal of a news report by the

vice president was an unusual move. In it, Pence also said his team will "focus all our efforts to advance the president's agenda and see him re-elected in 2020."

The report details efforts of several Republicans looking ahead to 2020, calling it a "shadow campaign." It notes Pence's political schedule and active fundraising, though it also says unnamed advisers have signaled that he'd only run if Trump doesn't. Trump, meanwhile, insisted his support is

stronger than ever. In a flurry of early morning tweets Monday, Trump says "the Trump base far bigger & stronger than ever before (despite some phony Fake News polling)." He specifically criticized the "failing @nytimes."

The New York Times article noted Pence has set up a fundraising committee. Called the Great America Committee, it can accept checks of up to \$5,000 from individual donors. Pence raised about \$1 million at a

Washington fundraiser last month, attended by dozens of lawmakers and featuring remarks from White House adviser Ivanka Trump. Trump has not suggested he won't seek a second term. But his first six months in office have been turbulent, marked by staff infighting, legislative struggles and a series of investigations.

White House counselor Kellyanne Conway also dismissed the report and said Pence is readying to run in 2020 "for

re-election as vice president." "Vice President Pence is a very loyal, very dutiful, but also incredibly effective vice president, and active vice president, with this president," said Conway on ABC's "This Week."

"He is a peer to the president in the West Wing," New York Times spokeswoman Danielle Rhoades Ha said in an emailed statement. "We are confident in the accuracy of our reporting and will let the story speak for itself." —AP

VENEZUELA ARMY REPELS ATTACK, HUNTS ASSAILANTS

VALENCIA: Venezuela's military was hunting a group of "mercenaries" yesterday who made off with weapons after an attack on an army base carried out against what they called the "murderous tyranny" of President Nicolas Maduro. Around 20 men led by an army officer who had deserted battled troops in the base in the third city of Valencia for three hours early Sunday, officials said.

The raid ended with two of the attackers being killed and eight captured, Maduro said on state television. The other 10 escaped with weapons taken from the facility, according to officials who said an "intense search" was underway for them. Maduro claimed the "terrorist" group had ties to Colombia and the United States.

The incident heightened fears that Venezuela's deepening political and economic crisis could explode into greater violence, perhaps open armed conflict. Officials insisted afterward that all was normal across the country. Military helicopters flew overhead and tactical armored vehicles patrolled the streets in Valencia, a major northwestern city, in a climate of tension on Sunday after the attack.

Locals said a nighttime curfew was imposed. Police dispersed protesters who had set up flaming barricades across roads. The armed forces said in a statement "a group of civilian criminals wearing military uniforms and a first lieutenant who had deserted" carried out the attack. Maduro said the lieutenant, among those captured, was "actively giving information and we have testimony from seven of the civilians."

Loyal military chiefs

Maduro congratulated the army for its

"immediate reaction" in putting down the attack, saying they earned his "admiration." Venezuela's opposition has repeatedly urged the military to abandon Maduro. But Defense Minister Vladimir Padrino, the head of the armed forces, has said the military's loyalty was unshakable. In a video posted online just before the attack, a man presenting himself as an army captain named Juan Caguaripano declared a "legitimate rebellion... to reject the murderous tyranny of Nicolas Maduro."

Speaking with 15 men in camouflage standing by him, some of them armed, he demanded a transitional government and "free elections." It was not known if he was the lieutenant referred to in the military statement, demoted for deserting, or whether he was another renegade officer. That statement said the lieutenant involved had deserted three years ago and taken refuge in Miami, in the US state of Florida.

Venezuela isolated

Venezuela has become increasingly isolated internationally as Maduro tightens his hold on power through a contested loyalist assembly that started work this week. The opposition, which controls the legislature, has been sidelined. Its leaders are under threat of arrest after organizing protests fiercely countered by security forces that have left 125 people dead in the past four months. The new Constituent Assembly, packed with Maduro allies including the president's wife and son, has quickly used its supreme powers to clamp down on dissent. On Saturday, it ordered the dismissal of the attorney general, Luisa Ortega, who had broken ranks with Maduro to become one of his most vociferous critics. — AFP

AFTER MILITARY SHAKE-UP, TURKEY TO TACKLE KURDS

ISTANBUL: Days after a reshuffle of Turkey's top military commanders, President Tayyip Erdogan has revived warnings of military action against Kurdish fighters in Syria that could set back the US-led battle against Islamic State. Kurdish militias are spearheading an assault against the hardline militants in their Syrian stronghold Raqqa, from where Islamic State has planned attacks around the world for the past three years. But US backing for the Kurdish YPG fighters in Syria has infuriated Turkey, which views their growing battlefield strength as a security threat due to a decades-old insurgency by the Kurdish PKK within its borders.

There have been regular exchanges of rocket and artillery fire in recent weeks between Turkish forces and YPG fighters who control part of Syria's northwestern border. Turkey, which has the second largest army in NATO after the United States, reinforced that section of the border at the weekend with artillery and tanks and Erdogan said Turkey was ready to take action. "We will not leave the separatist organization in peace in both Iraq and Syria," Erdogan said in a speech on Saturday in the eastern town of Malatya, referring to the YPG in Syria and PKK bases in Iraq. "We know that if we do not drain the swamp, we cannot get rid of flies."

The YPG denies Turkish allegations of links with Kurdish militants inside Turkey, saying it is only interested in self-rule in Syria and warning that any Turkish assault will draw its fighters away from the battle against Islamic State which they are waging in an alliance with local Arab forces. Erdogan's comments follow the appointment of three new leaders of Turkey's army, air force and navy last week - moves which analysts and officials said were at least partly aimed at preparing for any campaign against the YPG militia.

Turkish forces swept into north Syria last year to seize territory from Islamic State, while also cutting off Kurdish-controlled northeast Syria from the Kurdish pocket of Afrin further west. They thereby prevented Kurdish control over almost the whole sweep of the border - Ankara's worst-case scenario. Recent clashes have centered around the Arab towns of Tal Rifaat and Minnigh, near Afrin, which are held by the Kurdish YPG and allied fighters. Erdogan said Turkey's military incursion last year dealt a blow to "terrorist projects" in the region and promised further action. "We will make new and important moves soon," he said.

'More active' fight

His comments follow weeks of warnings from Turkey of possible military action against the YPG. Washington's concern to prevent any confrontation which deflects the Kurdish forces attacking Raqqa may help stay Ankara's hand, but a Turkish government source said last week's changes in military leadership have prepared the ground.

"With this new structure, some steps will be taken to be more active in the struggle against terror," the source said. "A structure that acts according to the realities of the region will be formed." The battle for Raqqa has been underway since June, and a senior US official said on Friday that 2,000 Islamic State fighters are believed to be still defending positions and "fighting for every last block" in the city.

Even after the recapture of Raqqa, US Defense Secretary Jim Mattis has left open the possibility of longer-term American assistance to the YPG. The influence of Turkey's once-dominant military has decreased dramatically since Erdogan came to power nearly 15 years ago. A purge in senior ranks since last year's failed military coup has stripped it of 40 percent of top officers. —Reuters

MINNESOTA MOSQUE EXPLOSION
'DEEPER, SCARIER' THAN THREATS
GOVERNOR: 'THIS IS AN ACT OF TERRORISM'

MINNEAPOLIS: The Dar Al-Farooq Islamic Center in suburban Minneapolis, like other US mosques, occasionally receives threatening calls and emails. Its leaders say they're more frightened now after an explosive shattered windows and damaged a room as worshippers prepared for morning prayers. "We feel like it's much deeper and scarier than like something random," Mohamed Omar, the center's executive director, said Sunday. "It's so scary."

No one was hurt in the blast, which happened around 5 am Saturday. Windows of the imam's office were shattered, either by what the FBI called an "improvised explosive device" or by an object thrown through them. The FBI is seeking suspects and trying to determine whether the incident was a hate crime. Gov Mark Dayton joined other public officials and community leaders for a meeting inside the building Sunday, describing the bombing as "so wretched" and "not Minnesota." "This is an act of terrorism. This is against the law in America," Dayton said at a news conference afterward, the Star Tribune reported.

A place for families

Besides serving as a place of worship and community center, the mosque in Bloomington, just south of Minneapolis, has a fitness center, gymnasiums for boys and girls, a football field and adjoins a city park, Omar said. He estimates the mosque holds up to 300 worshippers for Friday prayers. The community center also hosts computer classes, a basketball league, religious classes, lectures and other events.

"It's a place that a family can come and get everything they need," Omar said. The mosque opened in 2011 at the site of a former elementary school in the suburb of about 85,000, and serves people primarily from the area's large Somali community. Minnesota is home to the largest Somali community in the US, roughly 57,000 people, according to the latest census.

Some residents opposed the center's opening, and complaints have been made about

parking, noise and traffic, the Star Tribune reported. Omar said the center gets along with "92, 93 percent" of its neighbors. And while the mosque has received threatening calls and messages, Deputy Bloomington Police Chief Mike Hartley said Sunday he was unaware of any hate crimes reported at the center.

Reports of anti-Muslim incidents in the US are increasing, including arson attacks and vandalism at mosques, harassment of women wearing Muslim head coverings and bullying of Muslim schoolchildren. Also in Minnesota, an Islamic cemetery in Castle Rock Township recently reported it had been vandalized with spray painted profanities and swastikas.

A US Department of Homeland Security state-

ment on the Bloomington explosion says the department "fully supports the rights of all to freely and safely worship the faith of their choosing and we vigorously condemn such attacks on any religious institution." The reward for information leading to an arrest or conviction has grown to \$24,000, said Asad Zaman, director of the Muslim American Society of Minnesota. The Minnesota chapter of the Council on American-Islamic Relations, or CAIR, said its national office is urging Islamic centers and mosques to step up security. "If a bias motive is proven, this attack would represent another in a long list of hate incidents targeting Islamic institutions nationwide in recent months," said Amir Malik, the local chapter's civil rights director. —AP

TRANSGENDER CAMP TO INCLUDE 4-YEAR-OLDS

EL CERRITO: In some ways, Rainbow Day Camp is very ordinary. Kids arrive with a packed lunch, make friendship bracelets, play basketball, sing songs and get silly. But it is also extraordinarily unique, from the moment campers arrive each morning. At check-in each day, campers make a nametag with their pronoun of choice. Some opt for "she" or "he." Or a combination of "she/he." Or "they," or no pronoun at all. Some change their name or pronouns daily, to see what feels right.

The camp in the San Francisco Bay Area city of El Cerrito caters to transgender and "gender fluid" children, ages 4 to 12, making it one of the only camps of its kind in the world open to preschoolers, experts say. Enrollment has tripled to about 60 young campers since it opened three summers ago, with kids coming from as far as Los Angeles, Washington, D.C. - even Africa. Plans are underway to open a branch next summer in Colorado, and the camp has been contacted by parents and organizations in Atlanta, Seattle, Louisiana and elsewhere interested in setting up similar programs.

On a sunny July morning at camp, the theme was "Crazy Hair Day," and 6-year-old Gracie Maxwell was dancing in the sunshine as a Miley Cyrus song blasted from outdoor speakers. The freckled, blue-eyed blonde wore her hair in a braid on one side, a pigtail on the other and snacked on cereal as she twirled and skipped.

Gender changes or mood swings?

"Once she could talk, I don't remember a time when she didn't say, 'I'm a girl,'" said her mother, Molly Maxwell, who still trips over pronouns but tries to stick to "she." "Then it grew in intensity: 'I'm a sister. I'm a daughter. I'm a princess,'"

Maxwell said. "We would argue with her. She was confused. We were confused." Living in the liberal-minded Bay Area made it easier. The Maxwells found a transgender play group, sought specialists, and at 4 years old, let Gracie grow her hair, dress as a girl and eventually change her name.

"I see her now, compared to before. I watch her strut around and dance and sing and the way she talks about herself. If she was forced to be someone else," the mother trails off. "I don't even want to think about that." Gender specialists say the camp's growth reflects what they are seeing in gender clinics nationwide: increasing numbers of children coming out as transgender at young ages. They credit the rise to greater openness and awareness of LGBT issues and parents tuning in earlier when a child shows signs of gender dysphoria, or distress about their gender.

"A decade ago, this camp wouldn't have existed. Eventually, I do believe, it won't be so innovative," camp founder Sandra Collins said. "I didn't know you could be transgender at a very young age. But my daughter knew for sure at 2." Collins' experience as the mother of a transgender girl, now 9, inspired her to start the camp, and another for 13- to 17-year-olds called Camp Kickin' It.

"A lot of these kids have been bullied and had trauma at school. This is a world where none of that exists, and they're in the majority," Collins said. "That's a new experience for kids who are used to hiding and feeling small." Fourth grader Scarlett Reinhold, Collins' daughter who was born a boy, says at camp she can be herself. "I feel comfortable for being who I am and who I want to be," says Scarlett, a confident 9-year-old in a frilly skirt who wears her dark hair long and wavy.

No data on trans

There is little comprehensive data on young children who identify as transgender, but experts say as the number of young people coming to their clinics increases, the prevailing medical guidance has shifted. The favored protocol today is known as the "gender affirmative" approach, which focuses on identifying and helping transgender children to "socially transition" - to live as the gender they identify with rather than the one they were born with until they're old enough to decide on medical options like puberty blockers and later, hormone treatments.

The Center for Transyouth Health and Development at Children's Hospital in Los Angeles, started a decade ago with about 40 patients, now has over 900 people, ages 3 to 25, enrolled in its program, with 150 on its waiting list, said Johanna Olson-Kennedy, the clinic's medical director. "I just think there's a lot more openness to the understanding that trans adults start as trans kids," Olson-Kennedy said. "When people say, 'Isn't this too young?' my question back to them is, 'Too young for what? How young do people know their gender?' The answer to that is some people know it at 3, and some people know it at 30."

Diane Ehrensaft, director of mental health at the University of California, San Francisco's Child and Adolescent Gender Center, says enrollment there has tripled over the past few years with a "sea change - maybe we can even call it a tsunami - in the number of little kids showing up with their families." She fields a growing number of calls from families overseas, including South Africa, Ethiopia, Hong Kong, Belgium, England and other countries that lack resources. —AP

MACEDONIA AIMS TO SOLVE NAME ROW WITH GREECE

SKOPJE: After a quarter-century-long dispute that has blocked its entry to NATO and the European Union, Macedonia seems determined to end the row with Greece over its name. The quarrel between Skopje and Athens dates back to Macedonia's declaration of independence from Yugoslavia in 1991 and has poisoned neighborly relations. From the outset Greece denied its neighbor the right to use the name Macedonia, which is also the name of a northern Greek region.

Greeks have cited concerns about historical appropriation—both sides, for example, claim Alexander the Great as their own—and that the name Macedonia implies a broader territorial claim. Athens and the European Union recognize the small landlocked country by its provision-

al name, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (FYROM), under which it was also admitted to the United Nations.

Skopje has long insisted that this designation was only provisional, but in June, new Social Democratic Prime Minister Zoran Zaev seemed to relax the line of his nationalist predecessors. "With a FYROM reference we can become a member of NATO," Zaev said on a visit to the NATO headquarters in Brussels. As a member of both NATO and the European Union, Athens has vetoed Macedonia's attempts to join both blocs, but a calendar of bilateral meetings is now in place to try to resolve the dispute. In everyday conversation, Greeks usually refer to the neighboring country as "Skopje," the name of its capital city.

Horseback warrior

Back in 1992, a million Greeks—one tenth of the population—took to the streets in protest over the name issue in Thessaloniki, the main city in the Macedonia region. Tensions grew in 2006, when Skopje airport was named "Alexander the Great". The building in 2011 of a huge monument of the warrior king on a horse added fuel to the fire. Under international pressure, the statue in central Skopje was officially named "Warrior on a horse" but that did not deceive anyone—especially as, a year later, authorities inaugurated a giant statue of Philip II of Macedon, Alexander's father.

The issue remains hugely sensitive on both sides. Greece's migration minister

Yiannis Mouzalas last year faced calls to resign after referring to the country as "Macedonia" instead of "FYROM" during a television interview about the migrant crisis. Mouzalas quickly apologized "for this error, which does not reflect my position and my convictions on the subject of FYROM". On Tuesday, the Greek women's handball team was punished at the European Championship after refusing to play in Skopje against Macedonia's team wearing national logo bearing that name.

'Mobilization'

In Zaev's bid to end the row, he has spoken by telephone to his Greek counterpart Alexis Tsipras. The Macedonian Foreign Minister Nikola Dimitrov was in Athens in mid-June and his Greek coun-

terpart Nikos Kotzias is going to Skopje later this month. There is a "certain mobilization," a Greek diplomatic source told AFP, noting "some signs" of good will in Skopje. But the source said it was now necessary to "wait for action".

A top official in Zaev's SDSM party, who also asked not to be named, warned that Greece "could keep the same position for two centuries. We should find a solution to deblock the process of integration with NATO and the EU". But, in the fragile country of about two million people, the official warned it would be necessary to reach a political "consensus" and to back up any decision with a referendum. Many Macedonians are against a name change but some say they want a way out of the tiring row.—AFP

AT LEAST 11 KILLED IN 'BARBARIC' CHURCH SHOOTING IN NIGERIA

WARRI: At least 11 worshippers were shot dead at a church in southeast Nigeria on Sunday, with authorities suggesting the bloodshed was due to a local feud. Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari condemned the attack, describing the incident as "an appalling crime against humanity and unspeakable sacrilege," his office said.

Buhari said "there was no justification whatsoever to target church worshippers and kill them in cold blood." At around 6:00 am (0500 GMT) at least one gunman opened fire at Saint Philip's church in Ozubulu, near the city of Onitsha, unleashing terror on the congregation. Chukwuma Emeka said he had just stepped out of the church to stretch his legs "when I heard gunshots and screaming and people running inside." "When the chaos subsided I went inside, I saw my fellow church members dead in a pool of their own blood and many others were screaming in pain."

Attacks on churches are rare in southern Nigeria, where there is a predominantly Christian population. The country's mainly-Muslim north has been gripped by a violent campaign by Boko Haram jihadists, who specialize in targeting religious centers. There were varying accounts of what happened in Ozubulu. Witnesses said five gunmen in masks stormed the church, but police said the killing was the work of a lone shooter. "So far, 12 persons have been confirmed dead and deposited in the mortuary here," a worker at Nnamdi Azikiwe University Teaching Hospital told AFP.

Garba Umar, Anambra State police Commissioner, later said 11 people were killed while 18 were injured as a result of the shooting. Several worshippers with gunshot wounds were also receiving treatment at the

hospital, the source said. Witnesses said they feared that up to 20 people may have died.

'Feud'

Umar said the attacker was a gunman who "went on a shooting spree, killing and wounding" worshippers. He said the violence was the result of a failed murder attempt, tied to a feud within the local community. "The information at the disposal of the police is that the gunman had been hired to kill a particular family person believed to be among the worshippers," he said.

He said the governor of the state visited the scene and promised to pay the medical bills of the injured. Local rights activist Emeka Umeagbalasi said his information about the motive largely concurred with that of the police version. The gunmen had gone to kill the son of a local chief but failed to find him at his home, Umeagbalasi said. The attackers then went to the church to hunt for him, but could not find the intended target and became angry, he said. They opened "fire on parishioners and shot indiscriminately," he said, adding that the father of the intended target was shot and wounded. Speaker of Nigeria's House of Representatives Yakubu Dogara called the attack "barbaric... the height of wickedness."

He extended his condolences to families of the victims, assuring them that the government would do everything within its power to track down those responsible. Hundreds of churches and mosques in Nigeria's north have been attacked since 2009 when Boko Haram began a violent campaign to impose strict Islamic law. The rebellion has killed at least 20,000 people and forced some 2.6 million others to flee their homes, sparking a dire humanitarian crisis in the northeast.—AFP

WHY KENYANS ARE NERVOUS ABOUT PRESIDENTIAL VOTE

A LOOK AT THE ISSUES AROUND THE ELECTION

KAMPALA: Kenyans vote today in a close presidential election between President Uhuru Kenyatta, who seeks a second term, and Raila Odinga, who lost the last two elections. The East African high-tech and commercial hub of 44 million people is often described as one of the continent's most politically stable countries, but the torture and killing of a top election official has many recalling the disputed 2007 election between the same candidates that left more than 1,000 people dead. Here's a look at the issues around the vote:

THE CANDIDATES

Kenyatta and Odinga are from storied political families. Kenyatta is the son of Jomo Kenyatta, Kenya's first president, and Odinga is the son of Jaramogi Odinga Odinga, the country's first vice president. One must win more than 50 percent of the vote to avoid a runoff election. After losing the past two elections, this may be the last chance for the 72-year-old Raila Odinga to claim the seat that eluded his father. Odinga says he wants to restore a strong government, stamp out corruption and improve the lives of the poorest Kenyans.

The 55-year-old Kenyatta wants to avoid becoming the first Kenyan president not to win reelection. He won in 2013 with 50.03 percent of the vote, triggering an unsuccessful legal challenge by Odinga. Kenyatta at the time was facing criminal charges at the International Criminal Court over his alleged role in the 2007 election violence. Those charges were dropped due to lack of evidence, with the ICC prosecutor blaming unprecedented witness interference and bribery. This time, Kenyatta has appeared more confident while campaigning, pointing to major infrastructure projects, many backed by China, and claiming strong economic growth.

THE CALL OF TRIBE

Most political organizing in Kenya is tied to ethnicity. Many voters see Kenyatta as the candidate of the Kikuyu people, the country's largest ethnic group, and Odinga representing the Luo. That the Luo have never produced a head of state adds drama to the election. "Many middle-class Kenyans will, in an instant, go from speaking of globalization and borderless innovation while sipping on their cafe macchiatos to offering blind support to a well-known thug who happens to be from their tribes," journalist Daniel Kalinaki wrote in a recent column for the Daily Monitor newspaper.

Kenyatta's running mate under the Jubilee coalition, Deputy President William Ruto, is expected to marshal the votes of his Kalenjin people. Odinga leads the National Super Alliance, which includes political leaders of the Kamba and Luhya ethnic groups. But Kenya's political landscape is noted for shifting alliances. Kenyatta's running mate Ruto was an ally of Odinga in 2007, for example. Ruto is now being challenged at home by an influential governor who supports Odinga, which could split the Kalenjin vote that was crucial in Kenyatta's 2013 win.

CORRUPTION, POVERTY AND LAND

Severe drought conditions in half of Kenya's 47 counties have worsened tensions over land as farmers face invasions from semi-nomadic herders seeking room to graze their cattle. In Laikipia county, more than 30 people have died. Some farmers say politicians have incited the herders with the aim of shifting demographics in their favor and winning elections. Despite Kenya's expanding middle class and economic growth of 5.6 percent in 2016, according to national figures, poverty remains widespread. More than 40 percent of people live on less than \$2 a day. Official

corruption also feeds tensions.

LIKELIHOOD OF VIOLENCE

The Al-Shabab extremist group, based in neighboring Somalia, already has threatened Kenya's elections with a series of deadly attacks in border areas. That strains Kenya's security forces as they

seek to keep the elections free of violence. The torture and killing in late July of Christopher Msando, an official in charge of Kenya's electronic voting system, has fueled concerns that the vote could be rigged. The biometric system malfunctioned in the 2013 election, leading to opposition claims of vote tampering.—AP

PUSSY RIOT MEMBERS DETAINED OVER PROTEST IN SIBERIAN CITY

MOSCOW: Russian police yesterday detained two members of Pussy Riot after they staged a protest in support of a jailed Ukrainian filmmaker in a Siberian city. Maria Alyokhina, one of the punk rock group's members previously jailed for a protest against President Vladimir Putin, wrote on Twitter that she and Olga Borisova were being held in Yakutsk.

Alyokhina tweeted that they had been taken to a police station after protesting in support of filmmaker Oleg Sentsov, who is serving a 20-year term for "terrorist" offences in Yakutsk, almost 5,000 kilometers east of Moscow. "We're in Yakutsk police station No. 2," Alyokhina wrote. Borisova, in a video from a police car posted on Twitter, added: "We're going to the police station... on suspicion of committing an administrative offence, (holding) an unsanctioned rally."

Alyokhina on Sunday posted photos and a video of their brief protest on a bridge, calling Sentsov's case "one of the key political cases in the history of our country." For the protest, the women donned the group's signature colorful balaclavas and held flares and a sign saying "Free Sentsov." Sentsov was convicted for masterminding arson attacks on pro-Kremlin party offices in Crimea after Russia annexed the peninsula from Ukraine in March 2014.

His case was denounced by the West and filmmakers around the world continue to speak out in support for him. Ukrainian Foreign Minister Pavlo Klimkin praised the protest, writing on Twitter: "Respect to @pussyrriot for building the bridge of freedom in Yakutsk. #FreeSentsov" Alyokhina served a prison term for a protest performance in a Moscow cathedral, being convicted of hooliganism motivated by religious hatred.

Elsewhere, rescuers yesterday desperately tried to contact eight miners missing in a flooded Siberian diamond mine as investigators opened a

probe into suspected violations of safety rules. The accident on Friday at the mine in the Sakha region some 4,000 kilometers east of Moscow saw water flood in from a disused crater.

Russia's Investigative Committee, which probes serious crimes, said Monday it had opened a criminal case over suspected breaches of safety procedures at the mine, owned by the country's largest diamond producer Alrosa, punishable by up to three years in jail. Rescuers helped an injured miner escape on Saturday, bringing the total who have been evacuated to 143. He was hospitalized in a serious condition with hypothermia.

Specialized climbers were working on Monday to try to establish communications with the section where the remaining eight men are believed to be trapped by sending a signal through a drainage pipe, Alrosa said in a statement. The company's president Sergei Ivanov said Sunday that rescuers were trying to reach a location where the miners may be trapped, but the company denied a report that their exact whereabouts had been identified.

Specialist rescuers were also working inside the mine to clear tunnels blocked by mud from the flooding and rock fragments from the mining process, Alrosa said. The emergency situations ministry said rescuers had already explored along tunnels stretching almost seven kilometers and had cleared 200 meters of blocked tunnels.

The company was also working to set up extra pumps to remove water from the huge crater that is leaking into the underground mine shafts, to ensure the rescuers' safety. Relatives of the men still inside in the mine flew into the town of Mirny where the mine is located, Alrosa said, and were set to meet the company's leadership and rescuers. Alrosa made a net profit of 22.7 billion rubles (\$376.37 million) in the first quarter of 2017.—Agencies

SOUTH AFRICA'S ZUMA FACING SECRET VOTE

CAPE TOWN: A parliamentary vote of no confidence in South African President Jacob Zuma will be held by secret ballot, it was announced yesterday, a move that could encourage some ANC lawmakers to vote to oust him. The vote, scheduled for today, has become a test of African National Congress (ANC) unity as senior party figures have been increasingly critical of their leader, but it is unlikely to succeed in toppling Zuma. "Voting on the motion of no confidence in the president... will be by secret ballot," parliamentary Speaker Baleka Mbete announced, in a decision that took many analysts by surprise.

The president, who came to power in 2009, has been implicated in multiple corruption scandals, while the country's economy has fallen into recession and unemployment has risen to record levels. The 75-year-old is due to step down as head of the ANC in December, and as president before the 2019 general election-lessening pressure for his party to seek imminent change.

The vote has been subject to a long legal battle waged by opposition parties, with the Constitutional Court ruling that a secret ballot was permissible. "It's a surprising but strategic move," independent analyst Judith February told AFP. "Zuma is likely to remain even if a few MPs vote against him. I would be very surprised if Zuma goes by this process." "The decision takes the wind out of the sails of opposition as well as civil society marches and activism around this issue."

'Larceny on a grand scale'

Protests by pro- and anti-Zuma groups are planned in Cape Town, home of the South African parliament. The main opposition Democratic Alliance party said the vote was "an opportunity for us all to stand up to corruption and get rid of President

Zuma and his cabinet." A group of ANC veterans from the anti-apartheid struggle has also called for MPs to vote against Zuma, who was himself imprisoned with Nelson Mandela on Robben Island under white-minority rule. South Africa is "witness to larceny on a grand scale, leaving the country not only impoverished, but also increasingly in the hands of criminalized and compromised governance," the veterans said in a statement before Mbete's announcement.

"The motion of no-confidence in President Jacob Zuma is an inevitable outcome of the myriad scandals in which he has regrettably embroiled himself and his office," they added. The ANC has fought back, saying last week it expects its lawmakers to back the president. Party chief whip Jackson Mthembu said ousting Zuma would "have disastrous consequences that can only have a negative impact on the people of South Africa". But he acknowledged recent criticism of the ANC, and the impact of a cabinet reshuffle in March when respected finance minister Pravin Gordhan was replaced with a Zuma loyalist. Gordhan's sacking led to a string of downgrades to South Africa's credit rating as well as causing the rand currency to tumble. Public support for the ANC, which swept to power under Mandela in the first non-racial elections in 1994, slipped to 55 percent in last year's local polls — its worst-ever result.

Minister sorry over nightclub 'assault'

Meanwhile, a South African deputy minister yesterday apologized after he was accused of kicking and punching a woman at a nightclub in northern Johannesburg. Higher education deputy minister Mduzuzi Manana admitted he was involved in the "shameful incident," saying that "regardless of the extreme provocation, I should have exercised discretion." —AFP

AUSTRALIA'S RULING PARTY REFUSES VOTE TO RECOGNIZE GAY MARRIAGE

CANBERRA: Australia's ruling party yesterday rejected a push to allow lawmakers to decide whether the country should recognize gay marriage, continuing a bitter political stalemate over the divisive reform. The conservative Liberal Party-led coalition was narrowly re-elected in July 2016 with a promise to let voters decide whether Australia should recognize same-sex marriage through a popular vote. But the Senate would not allow the so-called plebiscite, which would have cost 160 million Australian dollars (\$127 million), and the result could have been ignored by lawmakers when deciding how to vote on gay marriage legislation in Parliament.

Liberal Sen Dean Smith, a gay man who opposed legalizing same-sex marriage when he was appointed to the Senate in 2012, has drafted a bill to allow gay marriage now and wants his fellow Liberal lawmakers to be allowed to vote on it according to their consciences rather than according to party policy. "It's time for the party to put the matter to rest once and for all," Smith told reporters before the meeting.

But a crisis meeting of Liberal lawmakers decided to try again to persuade the Senate to endorse the plebiscite before Parliament considers voting on legislation. The rejected plebiscite bill will be reintroduced to the Senate this week. Voting on the

plebiscite would be compulsory and failure to vote would be punishable by a fine.

Cheaper option

If the Senate again rejected it, the party would propose a voluntary postal plebiscite in which voters mail in their opinions instead of using ballot boxes as a cheaper option that would not need the Senate to approve the expense. The seven lawmakers who spoke against the plebiscite at the meeting were outnumbered more than three-to-one by 27 colleagues who supported the 2-year-old policy.

Finding policy agreement on the issue is a test of Prime Minister

Malcolm Turnbull's authority over his fragile government, which holds a single-seat majority in the House of Representatives. Lawmaker Andrew Broad had threatened to quit that government and predicted 16 of his colleagues in the Nationals party would follow if the Liberal Party opted to allow a parliamentary vote on gay marriage without a plebiscite.

"It won't be me only, the whole show would blow up," Broad told the Sunraysia Daily newspaper. "So suddenly you'd lose 16 lower house members in one bloc. Turnbull's leadership would become untenable and he'd no longer be prime minister," Broad added. Gay marriage campaigner Anna

Brown said she had legal advice that the government could not conduct a postal plebiscite without Senate approval. She said her advocacy group The Equality Campaign would seek a High Court injunction to prevent any postal plebiscite.

"The government needs to think very carefully before it expends up to AU\$100 million of taxpayer dollars when it could resolve this issue in Parliament as soon as this week," Brown said. Opinion polls show most Australians support gay marriage. But most of that support is soft, and gay-rights advocates are concerned that referendums rarely change the status quo in Australia. —AP

HONG KONG CLEANS BEACHES AFTER MASSIVE PALM OIL SPILL

HONG KONG: A clean-up operation was under way in Hong Kong yesterday after a massive palm oil spillage from a ship collision in mainland Chinese waters clogged some of its most popular beaches. The coast was coated with rancid-smelling sticky white clumps of the oil as it washed in Sunday, with 11 beaches still closed to swimmers Monday at the height of a summer heatwave. There are still lumps of the solidified oil on the beaches and the sea water in some areas is greasy.

Hong Kong comprises more than 200 islands with glittering bays, but there are increasing concerns about pollution and rubbish blighting its shores. On Pui O beach, on the island of Lantau, cleaners raked through the famous black sand Monday morning retrieving lumps of palm oil mixed with other trash, from plastic water bottles to children's toys.

Although there is still a red flag up and the beach is officially closed, some people ventured into the water. One 61-year-old surfer, who gave his name as Simon and is a regular at the beach, said there was still oil in the sea. "It got under my feet and on my board. It's all slippery," he told AFP. "Yesterday there was big chunks along the beach and in the water." He added that there was often rubbish on the beach, often left by visitors.

"I live here now, I have to put up with it. I don't like it," said Simon, who is an airport worker originally from Hawaii. Beach announcements told determined swimmers at the closed beaches to get out of the water Monday. But Agnes Mercado, 49, a regular at secluded South Bay on Hong Kong Island, was determined to take her morning dip, although she said she would not submerge her upper body. "Of course I'm worried about it, but it's even worse than this on some days," she said of the pollution.

Environmental impact

The Leisure and Cultural Services Department said beach workers were using absorbent strips to prevent the spread of the oil and government departments had been notified to clean up the water. In a statement late Sunday it described the palm oil as "harmless to the human body". But environmentalists still fear the potential impact and say the government has not done enough to contain the spillage. "Whilst we may not see birds covered in black oil, palm oil is hazardous to wildlife in that it attracts bacteria," said Gary Stokes of the Sea Shepherd Conservation Society.

Stokes added that the oil will dissolve and break down, which could also remove oxygen from the water and kill marine life. The leakage was caused by a collision between two vessels near the Pearl River estuary in southern China on Thursday, the marine department confirmed. It said it had sent nine vessels to clean up the palm oil lumps in waters off southwestern and southern Hong Kong.

In a statement to AFP it added that the clean-up had started Saturday, but did not respond to the question of how much oil had been leaked. Authorities in neighboring Guangdong province must give notification of oil spills, the department said. When asked why Hong Kong authorities had not been told of the Thursday spill until Saturday, the department said it was "because those substances may flow into Hong Kong waters after two days".

Swathes of rubbish frequently clog the coastline with authorities and environmentalists pointing the finger at southern mainland China as the source. However, campaigners also say Hong Kong itself has a terrible track record on dumping of waste—the city's landfills are groaning at capacity and there is no widespread recycling culture. —AFP

N KOREA DEFIANT AFTER NEW SANCTIONS, REJECTING TALKS

‘UNITED STATES WILL PAY THE PRICE FOR ITS CRIME’

MANILA: North Korea vowed yesterday that tough new United Nations sanctions would not stop it from developing its nuclear arsenal, as it rejected talks and angrily warned the United States of retaliation. The message of defiance was the first major response to the US-drafted sanctions, which the UN Security Council unanimously approved over the weekend and which could cost North Korea \$1 billion a year.

The North's sole major ally China, accused by the United States of doing too little to rein in Pyongyang, piled on the diplomatic pressure by vowing to fully implement the new sanctions. "We will under no circumstances put the nukes and ballistics rockets on (the) negotiating table," North Korean Foreign Minister Ri Yong-Ho said in a statement released in the Philippine capital Manila where he was attending a regional security forum.

"Neither shall we flinch even an inch from the road to bolstering up the nuclear forces chosen by ourselves unless the hostile policy and nuclear threat of the US against the DPRK (North Korea) are fundamentally eliminated." In an earlier statement released via its official KCNA news agency, North Korea threatened to make the United States "pay the price for its crime... thousands of times" for drafting the sanctions.

Ri was among two dozen ministers attending the security forum, including Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi, US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson and top diplomats from other Asia-Pacific nations. For his part, Tillerson ruled out a quick return to dialogue with North Korea, saying Washington would only consider talks if Pyongyang halted its ballistic missile program. "The best signal that North Korea could send that they're prepared to talk would be to stop these missile launches," Tillerson told reporters.

Tillerson did hold out the prospect of US envoys at some point sitting down with

Pyongyang, but he refused to say how long the North might have to refrain from testing more long-range missiles beforehand. "I'm not going to give someone a specific number of days or weeks. This is really about the spirit of these talks," he said. The sanctions were in response to the

DUTERTE ON HUMAN RIGHTS SCANDALS: DON'T GO THERE

MANILA: Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte met yesterday with America's top diplomat, where he voiced solidarity with the US amid global concerns over North Korea's nuclear program and angrily dismissed media questions about human rights abuses by his government. Duterte and US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson met in Manila at a regional Asia gathering. It was the highest-level interaction to date between a member of President Donald Trump's administration and Duterte, accused by human rights groups of flagrant abuses in his bloody war against illegal drugs.

If the two leaders discussed those or other US concerns about Duterte's government, they didn't do so in public. Instead, the two focused on the alliance between the two countries and on the North Korea issue as reporters were allowed in briefly for the start of their meeting. Entering an ornate, wood-paneled hall in the Philippine leader's palace, Tillerson was introduced to members of Duterte's Cabinet, shaking hands with each. Duterte welcomed the American and said he knew the US was concerned about Pyongyang's missile program. "You come at a time when I think the world is not so good, especially in the Korean Peninsula," Duterte said.

Global terrorism threats

Earlier, as they shook hands, the two ignored a shouted question about whether they'd discuss human rights. And at a news conference after their meeting, Duterte bristled but didn't answer directly when asked whether human rights had come up. "Human rights, son of a b***h," Duterte said, arguing he

shouldn't be questioned about alleged violations given the challenges he's facing. "Policemen and soldiers have died on me. The war now in Marawi, what caused it but drugs? So human rights, don't go there."

But ahead of the meeting, Duterte's presidential spokesman, Ernesto Bella, said the topic would indeed come up, along with other pressing matters such as global terrorism threats, economic cooperation and security in Marawi, the city that has been under siege by pro-Islamic State group militants for more than two months.

"We also welcome the opportunity to address concerns such as human rights if and when raised," Bella said in a statement. "We have always included this issue in our discussions and engagements with foreign governments, particularly Western democracies." The US, too, said ahead of the meeting that human rights would be among the topics on the agenda.

Human rights groups have questioned the Trump administration's willingness to engage with Duterte. But Tillerson argued there's no contradiction presented by the US decision to help his country fight the militants, whose insurgency in the Philippines has stoked global fears about the Islamic State group exporting violence into Southeast Asia and beyond.

Nearly 700 people have died in the intense fighting, including 528 militants and 122 soldiers and policemen, since hundreds of black flag waving gunmen stormed into buildings and homes in the business district and outlying communities of mosque-studded Marawi, a center of Islamic faith in the southern third of the predominantly Roman Catholic nation. —AFP

SE ASIA URGES MALAYSIA TO HALT MIGRANT CRACKDOWN

KUALA LUMPUR: Southeast Asian lawmakers yesterday urged Malaysia to halt a crackdown on migrant workers that has seen more than 6,000 foreigners detained and sparked alarm among rights groups. Relatively developed

Malaysia is a magnet for migrant workers from across Asia in sectors ranging from construction to agriculture, but several million are believed to be undocumented.

Authorities started rounding up illegal

workers after an official program to register undocumented foreigners ended on June 30. The latest official figures show 6,038 undocumented workers have been arrested in raids. The two largest groups represented were from Indonesia and Bangladesh, with substantial numbers also from Myanmar, the Philippines and Vietnam.

MPs from a group that brings together Southeast Asian lawmakers pushing for better human rights visited Malaysia on a fact-finding mission, and at the end of the trip made a plea for authorities to end the crackdown. "This inhumane action must be halted," Philippine Congresswoman Emmi De Jesus told reporters in Kuala Lumpur at the end of the visit. "Many migrants are living in constant fear. Poor treatment by law enforcement, including indefinite detention in abysmal conditions, are urgent concerns."

The group, ASEAN Parliamentarians for Human Rights, urged all Southeast Asian governments to adopt a binding regional treaty on migrant workers, aimed at protecting workers and their rights. Leading Malaysian migrant rights group Tenaganita said it was "upset to see such large numbers of undocumented workers including refugees being handcuffed, arrested, criminalized, sent to prisons and detention centers". The group says that many of the migrants are in reality victims of unscrupulous employers and agents who demand huge sums of money to bring them to the country, then leave them saddled with huge debts. Migrant workers typically do manual jobs spurned by locals. A total of 135 employers have also been detained in the crackdown, according to official figures. —AFP

RYAN FOCUSES ON HOME BUT CAN'T ESCAPE QUESTIONS

With a dysfunctional Congress on recess, House Speaker Paul Ryan has turned his focus back home, touring flood-damaged areas and visiting local businesses in Wisconsin. But he can't escape the questions about why Republicans in charge of Washington aren't delivering. And though he's won re-election easily for years, Ryan faces the prospect of challenges from left and right and an energized Democratic base in next year's midterm elections. "We have a majority in the House and Senate and it feels like nothing's getting done," 32-year-old James Hulse said just before Ryan recently toured his workplace.

Sensing the angst, Ryan has been much more visible in his southeast Wisconsin district as Republicans failed to deliver on their yearslong promise to scrap the health care law and new polling numbers show the speaker is less popular among Republicans in Wisconsin than President Donald Trump. Trump won Wisconsin by less than a percentage point, but he carried Ryan's district by 10 points.

In the remaining months of the year, Ryan and the Republican-led Congress are determined to deliver major legislation, elusive so far due to GOP infighting, and the top priority is overhauling the nation's tax code. Failure to produce could cost Republicans their House majority in the 2018 midterms and, for Ryan, his job as speaker and Republican leader. "This is the third time in 100 years we've had this alignment of government that we've got to get it done or else I really worried our country will continue down a bad path," Ryan said after his tour of the wire manufacturer Banker Wire, in Mukwonago, Wisconsin. He later told the Wisconsin State Journal, "If we don't do our job, we will depress turnout. I am frustrated as well."

Republican Keith Ketzler, 62, worries that the GOP will pay politically next year. Democrats need to flip 24 seats to regain control. "Everybody that voted Republican is getting very frustrated," Ketzler said, after prodding Ryan about why Congress hasn't achieved more. "People crossed the line last time, but they're not going to stay crossed if they don't get things done."

Ryan angered some conservatives during the campaign with comments critical of then-candidate Trump. But in the first six months of Trump's term, Ryan has been far less critical of the president than other Republican lawmakers who have challenged a number of Trump moves, including his criticism of Attorney General Jeff Sessions, a former senator.

Ryan's Republican primary challenger last year, Paul Nehlen, initially won the backing of then-candidate Trump, who later switched to Ryan. Ryan beat Nehlen by 70 percentage points in the primary. But Nehlen, who is running again, thinks 2018 will be more difficult for Ryan, arguing that he hasn't done enough to appease Republican Trump supporters. "President Trump has given Paul Ryan way more opportunities to stand up and back him and what he has done is really undermine him," Nehlen said.

Beating Ryan will not be easy. No Democrat has represented the district since 1995. Ryan has cruised to re-election ever since he joined Congress in 1999 - winning by 35 percentage points last year. He has \$11.5 million in the bank and is a familiar face in Janesville where he was born and raised and still lives with his wife and three children.

'Iron Stache'

Democrats are pinning their hopes on Randy Bryce, an Army veteran and union iron worker with the nickname "Iron Stache". He appears to have walked out of Hollywood central casting - complete with a dark mustache, thick biceps, faded blue jeans and a promise to fight for the working man. Bryce is trying to capitalize on disenchantment over Ryan's role in the health care bill as he mounts a long-shot campaign.

Bryce generated excitement among Democrats both in Wisconsin and nationally for his announcement video in June that has now been viewed more than 550,000 times. It begins with a clip of Trump praising Ryan's attempts to undo Democrat Barack Obama's Affordable Care Act and then shows Bryce getting emotional as his mother details her struggle with multiple sclerosis. "You can come work the iron," the hardhat-wearing Bryce challenges Ryan, "and I'll go to DC." Bryce raised \$430,000 in the first two weeks after the spot ran. Ryan has tried to shift the conversation from the collapse of the GOP healthcare effort and toward tax reform and the news that Taiwanese iPhone manufacturer Foxconn plans to invest \$10 billion on a factory in his congressional district that could employ 13,000 people. — AP

'CHICKENS VS ALIENS' AND OTHER MODERN MYTHS

In the fairy tale of "The Travelling Princess", the heroine is granted one wish: To travel through foreign lands, meet new friends and share her riches with the people she meets. At the end of her journey, Princess Amira gives up her crown, and makes her home in Greece among the families of refugees who have fled Syria's war, helping children to find lost parents and one day return to the lives they have left behind. The story is one of eight tales in a collection of modern myths and fables invented by Syrian and Kurdish children living in Thessaloniki, Greece.

Brazilian journalist Debora de Pina Castiglione and her sister, illustrator Beatriz, recorded the stories and worked with designers and translators to create a book now sold in 11 languages throughout Europe. "Travelling Tales" aims to encourage communication between young refugees and others children, through the universal language of myth and wild imagination, Beatriz said. "The stories created by the children are super happy, and full of creativity and adventure, and really funny."

Beatriz, one of five illustrators to contribute to the book, said the sisters wanted to give children and their parents a chance to talk about the war and refugee crises. But the book is above all an expression of childhood fun that should allow readers in communities hosting refugees to see the authors not as victims but as children, who share their excitement and fantastical imagination, she added.

Among the stories, readers find a plucky duck who lives in a chocolate house, a king who gets lessons in kindness from his children, and a battle between aliens and chickens for earth's last remaining eggs. "There's a lot of fantasy: there are extraterrestrials, fairies, magic - it's really diverse," Beatriz told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

Journalist Debora has volunteered in the Greek camps since Aug 2016 and said she and her sister had long dreamed of working together on a book. Over four months, Debora hosted workshops with children aged between four and 14 in three camps - Vasilika, Lagadikia and Oreokastro - and in the city of Thessaloniki, to listen to stories and help children develop ideas. She said they had not aimed to get the children to discuss their experiences fleeing

war, but instead to create a space for them to express themselves.

As they began recording stories, one theme reappeared in every tale, best demonstrated by Princess Amira, said Beatriz. "In all of the stories children speak about welcoming and belonging and being accepted, which reflects obviously the experience they have been

through," she said. The book has been popular in Italy and Greece, countries with large refugee populations, said Beatriz. Some 60,000 refugees and migrants, many from Syria, have become stranded in makeshift and formal camps across Greece since Balkan countries closed their borders last year to those trying to reach western and northern Europe. —Reuters

YI STRUGGLE AGAINST POVERTY

For Jisi Lazuo, the torch festival in her village in southwest China should be a celebration involving colorful ethnic clothes and eating freshly slaughtered pig. Instead, it's a time of stress. "In my heart I always get worried when the torch festival comes along," said Jisi, 37, who supports a family of two grandparents and four children. "Traditional clothes are quite expensive, but for my own kids I can only buy whatever I can get," she said.

Jisi belongs to the isolated Yi ethnic community. They have a distinct language and culture, and are among the poorest in China. Most live in Liangshan, a mountainous district in the southwestern province of Sichuan and one of 14 areas of "concentrated poverty" identified by the central government. Average incomes in Liangshan are just 27 percent of the national average, official data shows. An ambitious poverty reduction campaign is seeking to change this, ensuring by 2020 that no one is living in poverty - defined by the government as less than 2,300 yuan a year.

China has lifted hundreds of millions of its citizens out of poverty over the past few decades, but doing the same for groups like the Yi poses a different set of challenges. "A lot of that poverty is not as easily accessible for the government," said Ben Westmore, a senior economist at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). "It's people who live in mountainous areas who are not very well connected, or they're more dispersed at the provincial level across the prefectures," he said.

From road building to subsidies, the central government has spent large amounts of money on poverty relief in places like Liangshan. In 2016, the Liangshan government distributed 940 million yuan (\$139 million) in basic income assistance for the poorest in the region, according to the government website. Officials in charge of Liangshan's anti-poverty campaign declined to comment on the programs. The State Council poverty alleviation office in Beijing also declined to comment.

While many Yi welcome the state's help, some question whether cash handouts are sustainable. "Just giving out money is useless because one day the money will eventually run out," said Emu Zhiji, one of the few people in his village to receive a university education. Emu said he hopes to become a sports teacher, something that would be impossible for many Yi. Thirty percent are illiterate, compared to 4 percent nationally, and many do not speak Mandarin, the main language in China. As a result, they have limited options for earning a living beyond farming.

The government has tried to improve access to education for the Yi, but it struggles to recruit teachers to work in such a remote area. Many students battle to keep up with lessons taught in Mandarin. Emu said more needs to be done to allow the Yi to develop within their own culture if they are to alleviate the poverty and a dependency on government programs. "If we had better jobs we'd be able to feed and clothe ourselves on our own, but for that we need to be able to use our own language," he said. — Reuters

CALIF BUTCHER DISPLAYS ANTI-MEAT SIGN

It was perhaps only a matter of time in ultra-progressive California, but a luxury butcher's shop is surprising patrons with a sign warning about the cruelty of eating meat. "Attention: Animals' lives are their right. Killing them is violent and unjust, no matter how it's done," reads the notice greeting patrons of The Local Butcher Shop in Berkeley. The business stuck the sign in its window as part of a "peace treaty" with animal rights activists in the left-leaning university town who have been picketing the store for the last four months.

Every Sunday as it opened for butchery lessons, it was besieged by demonstrators from rights group Direct Action Everywhere (DXE) - sometimes naked, dripping with fake blood and wrapped in cellophane. Monica Rocchino, co-owner of The Local Butcher Shop with her husband Aaron, was at her wits' end and decided to meet with the activists. "They said they wanted Berkeley to become a meat-free city and they were ready to shut down our business," said Monica. "We asked for actions we could do. And they said they'd think about it, but they

kept protesting for 10 weeks. They made our neighbors mad, our neighborhood businesses were losing customers." Finally, DXE laid down its conditions for burying the hatchet.

Ideal meat

"Either we had to become a vegan butchery or we had to stop giving these classes, or put up a sign saying that animals have rights," Monica told AFP. She says the sign hasn't impacted custom. "We go to great lengths to make sure our meat is from local ranches, is raised as humanely as possible, free of antibiotics. We want... this to be the ideal meat. Our customers know this and support us." She acknowledges, however that the sign will not placate DXE, for whom the issue is black-and-white. "For them, you kill animals or you don't. I understand that belief but it's another thing to force your ideas on other people," says Monica.

Berkeley, the cradle of the US universities' free speech movement, has been the scene of regular demonstrations from the days of the anti-Vietnam War campaign to recent protests against visiting right-wing

speakers. Recently it has been criticized for chilling free speech after canceling an appearances by firebrand pundit Ann Coulter and right-wing provocateur and former Breitbart editor Milo Yiannopoulos.

Berkeley also happens to be the epicenter of America's organic food industry, its reputation for being green sent up in the TV series "Portlandia," in which restaurateurs provide photographic evidence that their meat is from ethically-raised animals. DXE organizer Matt Johnson says one of the group's activists felt his blood chill as he saw "an advertisement for these courses where people are taught how to properly dismember the body of an animal."

In line with the better-known Peta animal welfare association, DXE directs its protests "everywhere where violence against animals is normalized - rodeo, circuses, restaurants, the butchers". "We don't have any ill will against any individual, no hate for butchers - only love for animals," says Johnson. "But we cannot accept small businesses misleading people, saying this is just fine, to be promoting a better brand of violence." — AFP

IRAN PAPERS SLAM MP SELFIES

TEHRAN: Iran's newspapers were dominated yesterday by accusations lawmakers had embarrassed themselves by clamoring to take selfies with EU foreign policy chief Federica Mogherini during her visit to parliament. Mogherini was among dozens of foreign guests in Iran for the inauguration of President Hassan Rouhani on Saturday, but she appeared to capture the most attention as members of parliament crowded round to grab a snap with her.

Images of the lawmakers perched on desks and lining up with their smartphones in front of the Italian diplomat triggered a storm of anger and ridicule on Iranian social media under the hashtag "selfies of humiliation". "Dear MPs, thank

you for disgracing 80 million people," wrote one Twitter user. Others drew comparisons with iconic images such as Walt Disney's seven dwarves lining up to fawn over Snow White. At least one lawmaker apologized for his lack of decorum, but the issue still dominated yesterday's front pages.

The reformist Ghanoun daily had a cartoon of Mogherini in the style of Edvard Munch's famous painting "The Scream", with Iranian parliamentarians peeping from the corners with their mobile phones snapping away. The episode "shows the lack of proper education in the country", it wrote in its editorial. But the ultra-conservative Kayhan newspaper did not see the funny side. — AFP

The crisis eased on July 27 when Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu ordered the removal of the metal detectors. He has also promised to investigate the embassy incident. Abdullah's visit was seen by analysts as a show of support for Abbas, who has been isolated by Israel over his response to the Al-Aqsa row.

The mosque compound is in east Jerusalem, occupied by Israel in 1967 in a move never recognised by the international community. The 1994 peace treaty between Israel and Jordan recognizes Amman's special status as official custodian of Jerusalem's holy Muslim sites. About half of Jordan's 9.5 million citizens are of Palestinian origin. Netanyahu's removal of the metal detectors was seen by Palestinians as a victory.

At Abbas' headquarters a large banner displayed a picture of the Al-Aqsa compound with the slogan "Jerusalem is victorious". "It appears that King Abdullah wants to show through his visit that he stands with the Palestinian people in the battle for Jerusalem," Palestinian political analyst Abdel Majid Sweilem told AFP. In a statement on the official state news agency Petra, the king was quoted as saying that without Jordanian "custodianship and the

steadfastness of the Jerusalemites, the holy sites would have been lost many years ago".

During the crisis over the metal detectors, 82-year-old Abbas suspended security coordination with Israel, and this has remained suspended despite their removal. The decision sparked Israeli anger, with accusations he was encouraging violence. "This visit sends a message from his majesty that he is willing to contribute to removing president Abbas's isolation following his decision to stop the security coordination with Israel," Samir Awad, politics professor at Birzeit University near Ramallah in the West Bank, told AFP.

In January, US President Donald Trump came to power promising to push Israelis and Palestinians towards a peace deal, raising brief hopes among Palestinians that his unconventional approach could achieve results. But Palestinians have become increasingly frustrated by what they see as his negotiating team's one-sided approach. Trump's team has yet to publicly commit to the two-state solution, the idea of an independent Palestinian state next to Israel that has been the basis of decades of international consensus. Malki said Abbas and Abdullah had agreed that for any political process to move forward "there must be recognition of the principle of a two-state solution". — AFP

registered in the kingdom since the outbreak of the Syria conflict in 2011. The other Syrians include migrant laborers who came before the war, and those who never registered as refugees.

The figures on early marriage include all Syrians in Jordan, not just registered refugees. Many came from southern Syria's culturally conservative countryside, where even before the conflict girls typically married in their teens. Still, the study shows a higher rate of early marriage among Syrians in exile than in their homeland. The teen divorcee fled Syria's Daraa province in 2012, along with her parents and four siblings. The family eventually settled in a small town in the northern Mafraq province.

The parents and the teen, now 17, spoke on condition of anonymity because of the stigma of divorce. They said they wanted to speak out, nonetheless, in hopes of helping others avoid the same mistake. Child brides are traditionally shielded from outsiders, and the family provided a rare glimpse at what drives early marriage. "When we came here, our lives were disrupted," said the teen's mother, sitting on a floor cushion in the living room of their small rented home. "If we had remained in Syria, I would not have allowed her to get married this young."

The family scrapes by on small cash stipends and food vouchers from UN aid agencies, along with the father's below-minimum-wage income as a laborer. Worse, the family feels adrift. The parents, fearful their children would be harassed, especially the girls, did not enroll them in local schools, typically overcrowded to accommodate large numbers of Syrians. In such a setting - girls sitting at home without a seeming purpose - the push to have them get married becomes stronger.

An older sister of the teen also married as a minor. The mother said she often feels regret about her daughter having been robbed of her childhood. The younger girl spent most of her time at home, brooding. She had no girlfriends since she didn't go to school and was only allowed to leave the house with her mother, in line with

traditions. In any case, there was nothing to do in the small desert town.

Two years ago, a young Syrian man asked for the teen's hand, after introductions had been made by a go-between. The intermediary talked up the stranger, saying he had job prospects and could afford his own apartment. The teen, 15 at the time, accepted. "I was bored and sad," she said. "I wanted to get married." The parents said the young man seemed immature, but that their daughter insisted. The wedding took place a month later, and the bride wore a white dress.

The marriage contract was sealed by a Syrian lawyer, not a Jordanian religious court judge, meaning it was not officially recognized in Jordan. Local law sets the minimum age of marriage for girls at 18, though Jordanian judges often allow exceptions for brides between the ages of 15 and 17. In 2015, 11.6 percent of Jordanian females who married that year were minors, compared to 9.6 percent in 2010, indicating a slight rise that Zoubi believes is caused in part to Jordanians being influenced by Syrian customs.

After marriage, the Syrian teen moved to a different town with her husband, and his promises quickly evaporated. The couple moved in with his extended clan, and the teen turned into a maid, according to her parents. The teen said her unemployed husband beat her. Despite the abuse, she said she wanted to stay in the marriage, fearful of the shame of divorce. Her father eventually insisted on divorce to extract her from what he felt was a harmful situation.

After returning home, the teen briefly attended an informal education and children's support program called Makani that is run by the UN child welfare agency and other aid groups at centers across Jordan. She started making friends, but stayed away again when a new group of students signed up. Robert Jenkins, the head of UNICEF in Jordan, said that by the time girls are married, it's often too late to get them back to education. "Our absolute first line of defense is prevention (of early marriage)," he said, adding that the agency tries to support families and teens so they won't opt for early marriage. — AP

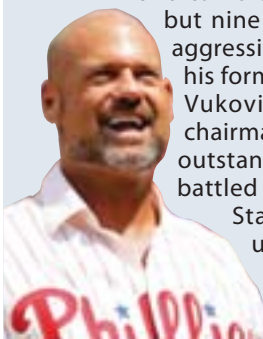

FORMER ALL-STAR CATCHER DARREN DAULTON DIES AT 55

PHILADELPHIA: Darren Daulton, the All-Star catcher who was the leader of the Philadelphia Phillies' NL championship team in 1993, has died. He was 55. Daulton had battled brain cancer since 2013. He had two tumors removed during brain surgery on July 1, 2013, but nine days later was diagnosed with glioblastoma, an aggressive form of brain cancer that also took the lives of his former teammate Tug McGraw and former coach John Vukovich. "Darren was a true leader of men," Phillies chairman emeritus Bill Giles said. "In addition to being an outstanding clubhouse leader, he was also a fighter. He battled through five knee operations to become an All-Star. I really enjoyed watching him for 14 years in uniform. Darren was a super human being. His teammates loved him, I loved him like he was one of my own." — AP



CHELSEA OWNER ABRAMOVICH SPLITS FROM WIFE: SPOKESMAN

MOSCOW: Russian billionaire and Chelsea football club owner Roman Abramovich and his partner, gallerist Dasha Zhukova, have separated, a spokesman for Abramovich confirmed to AFP. "After 10 years together, the two of us have made the difficult decision to separate, but we remain close friends, parents, and partners in the projects we developed together," the two said in a statement sent to AFP Monday by Abramovich's spokesman John Mann. Abramovich, 50, is Russia's 12th richest businessman, according to Forbes magazine, with a fortune of \$9.1 billion. He has owned Chelsea football club since 2003. The statement on Monday did not make clear whether Abramovich and Zhukova, 36, are married, although this has been previously reported. Abramovich and Zhukova have two children together, a son and daughter. In the couple's joint statement, they said that "We are committed to jointly raising our two children." —AFP

TUILAGI, SOLOMONA SENT HOME FROM ENGLAND CAMP

LONDON: Manu Tuilagi and Denny Solomona have been sent home from an England training camp due to "team culture issues", the Rugby Football Union announced yesterday. "Denny Solomona and Manu Tuilagi have been sent home today from England's training camp following team culture issues," the RFU said in a short press release. "We will not be commenting further." Britain's Press Association said the pair were disciplined for drinking alcohol during a three-day get-together in Teddington, southwest London. Leicester centre Tuilagi, 26, was only recalled to the England fold last Thursday, a succession of injuries having prevented him from playing for his country since March 2016. New Zealand-born Sale wing Solomona, 23, made his England bow during a two-Test tour of Argentina in June, crowning his debut with a late match-winning try in a 38-34 win in San Juan. —AFP



CAPTAINS GO FOR YOUTH IN SOLHEIM CUP SELECTIONS

ST ANDREWS: US captain Juli Inkster added a pair of rookies to her Solheim Cup team for matches that will see plenty of new faces. Inkster, the captain for the second straight time, added 18-year-old Angel Yin and Austin Ernst to her 10 automatic qualifiers. She passed over the experience in Paula Creamer and six-time Solheim Cup veteran Angela Stanford. Creamer, a captain's pick in 2015, will miss her first Solheim Cup since she turned pro.

"This has been a really tough day," said Inkster, herself a nine-time Solheim Cup participant. "I don't know if there's ever been so many people in the running for two captain's picks. I could have gone a lot of different ways. But in the end I went with my gut, and who I thought deserved a chance to play. I hope it turns out OK. That's all I can say."

The Solheim Cup is Aug. 18-20 at Des Moines Golf and Country Club. The Americans rallied to beat Europe two years ago in Germany and have a 9-5 record in the series that dates to 1990. The 10 qualifiers for the United States were Women's PGA champion Danielle Kang, Cristie Kerr, Jessica Korda, Brittany Lang, Stacy Lewis, Brittany Lincicome, Gerina Pillier, Lizette Salas, Lexi Thompson and Michelle Wie. All

but Kang have played in the matches.

European captain Annika Sorenstam also preferred youth rather than familiarity with the Solheim's uniquely partisan atmosphere. Former Women's British Open champion Catriona Matthew - an eight-time Solheim Cup player - was one of those left disappointed, although the 48-year old Scot will still make the trip to Iowa as one of Sorenstam's assistant captains.

"It is always hard to say 'no' to someone who lives for the Solheim Cup," Sorenstam said. "She was involved in the plans and knew the players we were talking about and that made it awkward at times. But she has been strong and mature and I am happy to have her on the team either way."

Four of Europe's players - Emily Pedersen of Denmark, Modelene Sagstrom of Sweden and English pair Georgia Hall and Florentine Parker - will be making their Solheim Cup debuts, with Pedersen and Sagstrom two of Sorenstam's four picks.

The other wild cards - Anna Nordqvist and Caroline Masson - will be making their fifth and third appearances in Europe's colors, respectively. Rounding out the European team were Carlotta Ciganda, Charley Hull, Karine Icher, Suzann Pettersen, Melissa Reid and Jodi Ewart Shadoff. — AP

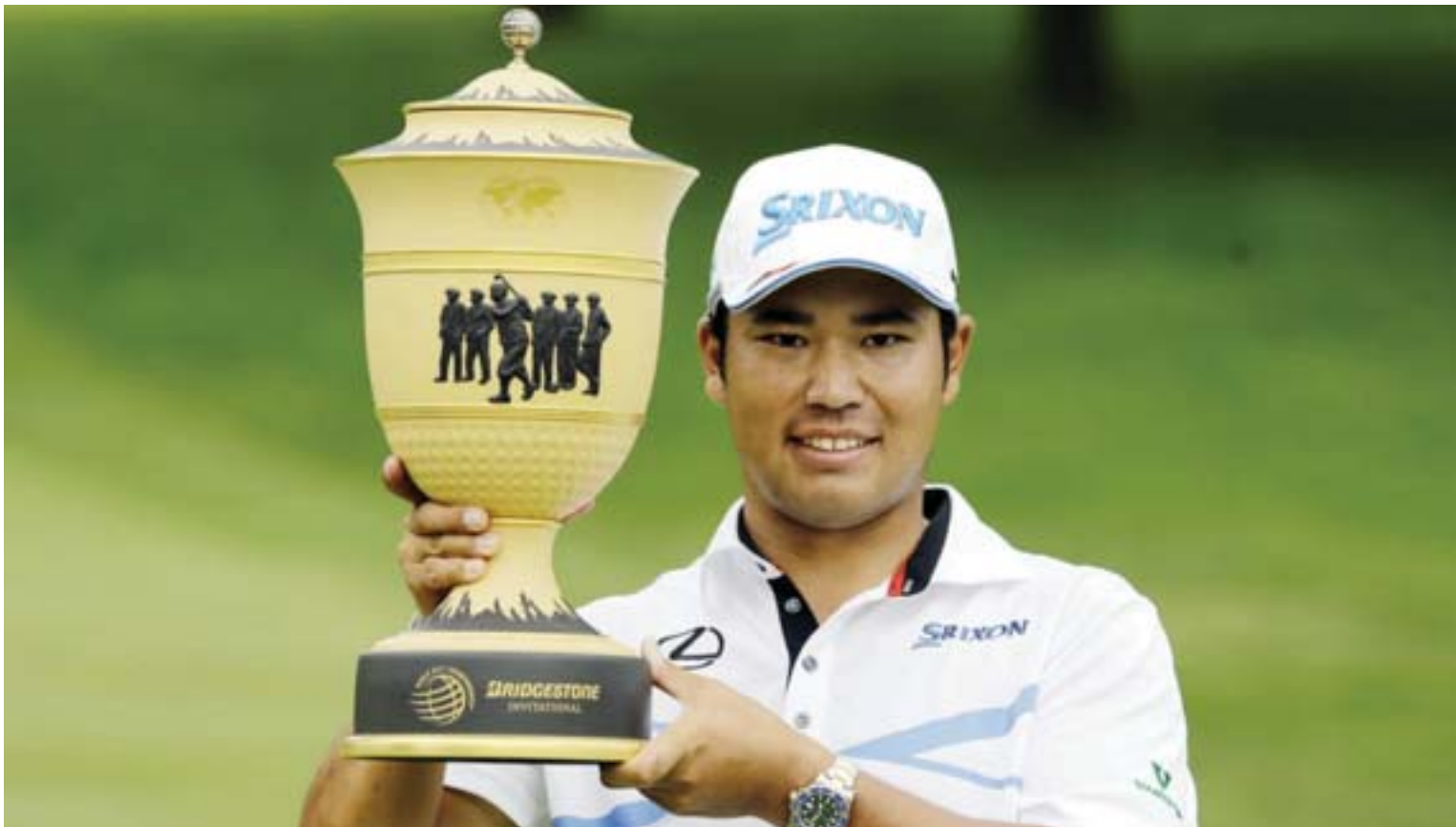

HIDEKI MATSUYAMA WINS AT FIRESTONE WITH BIG FINISH

AKRON: Hideki Matsuyama was along for the ride four years ago when he watched Tiger Woods tear apart Firestone Country Club on his way to a 61 in the second round, which tied the South course record and sent Woods to a seven-shot victory in the Bridgestone Invitational.

"I just couldn't believe that anyone could shoot 61 on this golf course," Matsuyama said. He sure didn't expect that from himself Sunday, especially after warming up so badly that Matsuyama wasn't sure which the way ball was going. Some four hours later, the 25-year-old Japanese star had a place alongside Woods in the record book.

Matsuyama finished with three straight birdies to cap off a runaway victory with a 9-under 61, giving him his second World Golf Championship in nine months. It was the lowest final round in four decades at venerable Firestone, and it gave Matsuyama a five-shot victory over Zach Johnson. He finished at 16-under 264 and moved back to the top of the FedEx Cup standings.

Matsuyama found more than just his swing after he left the range. He might have found the game that first elevated him to the elite in golf last fall when he had four victories and two runner-up finishes over six straight tournaments. And the timing couldn't be better with the PGA Championship four days away, with a Japanese nation clamoring for its first major champion.

"I hope their expectations aren't too high," Matsuyama said. "But my expectations really at the beginning of this week weren't that high, either, and here we are." He won for the third time this season, joining Dustin Johnson and Jordan Spieth for most on the PGA Tour.

"Once he gets going, he just keeps the hammer down and keeps it going," Rory McIlroy said. "It's very impressive. He's played very impressively over the past 18 months with a lot of wins and a lot of good finishes. That's the caliber of player he is. I expect him to be right up there next week, as well."

Matsuyama, who started the final round two shots behind Thomas Pieters and Zach Johnson, quickly got into the hunt by chipping in from 60 feet for eagle. He took the lead for the first time on No. 6 with a 15-foot birdie, and then he was gone. Woods shot 61 twice at Firestone. Jose Maria Olazabal in 1990 and Sergio Garcia in 2014 were the other players to do it. Matsuyama knew from his experience playing with Woods in 2013 what it would take. And just like everything else on this day, he made it look easy.

BIG STEP

He spun a wedge back to 4 feet on the par-5 16th for birdie. He holed an 8-foot putt on the 17th hole and then closed with another approach and settled 6 feet away. Matsuyama, who began the final round two shots behind Johnson and Thomas Pieters, finished at 15-under 265.

He now has won two World Golf Championships by a combined 12 shots, having captured the HSBC Champions by seven shots in Shanghai last fall. Johnson, winless since his British Open victory two years ago at St. Andrews, pulled within one shot with a long birdie putt at the 11th, but he could do no better than pars the rest of the way and shot 68.

Pieters was never in the game after missing 4-foot par putts on successive holes to close out the front nine. He closed with a 71. The only other player with a chance was Charley Hoffman,

who also was one shot behind on the back nine. Hoffman was three shots behind on the par-5 16th hole when his caddie suggested laying up because there was no place to get it close by going for the green 282 yards away.

"I'm trying to win a tournament," Hoffman said. "I'm tired of finishing second." He ripped a 3-wood onto the green and over the back into light rough, chipped weakly to 15 feet and made par anyway. He wound up with a 66 to finish third, though it was a big step in trying to make his first Presidents Cup team.

Matsuyama's final birdie broke by one shot the lowest final round by a winner at Firestone. Fulton Allem shot 62 when he won the old

World Series of Golf in 1993. McIlroy got within one shot of the lead on the front nine with three birdies in six holes until his momentum stalled with a few missed putts. He stumbled on the back nine and shot 69, leaving him in a tie for fifth with Russell Knox, Paul Casey and Adam Hadwin.

Spieth closed with a 68 and tied for 13th in his last tournament before he goes for the career Grand Slam in the PGA Championship. After the Bridgestone Invitational, add one more player - Matsuyama - to the list of major obstacles in his way. "I haven't won a major yet. I have a lot of work left to do," Matsuyama said. "But that's not to say that I don't have confidence." — AP

AUTISTIC GOLFER LEE DREAMS OF GREEN JACKET

ANSEONG: Golf is among the most solitary of sports, its players engaged in a constant struggle with themselves as they compete against the implacable opponent of par.

But for autistic newly qualified professional Simon Seungmin Lee, it is a way to escape from his enclosed self and engage with the world. The 20-year-old South Korean, who grew up in the US, has been medically assessed as having the communication skills of a child half his age-and the socialisation abilities of a 10-month-old baby.

But six years after taking up the clubs, and following five failed attempts, he secured professional status at a Korea PGA trial in May-one of the few autistic people to do so anywhere in the world. His next goal is a tour card at the Korea PGA qualifying school in November. "I love golf," said Lee, who has difficulty speaking and whose mother helped him communicate throughout the interview. "I want to win the Masters," he added.

'GOOD NIGHT, MOTHER'

Lee started showing symptoms in his early childhood in the United States where his father, a South Korean diplomat, was stationed. "He started avoiding eye contact and replying with what the other person had just said. My heart sank one day when I said, 'Good night Seungmin', and he replied 'Good night Seungmin', instead of 'Good night mother'," she said of the phenomenon known as echolalia.

He tends to show attachments to certain objects - another common symptom - most notably a Patrick the Starfish character doll he was given when the family went to the Universal Studios theme park in Orlando, Florida 10 years ago.

Asked by his mother who he would rescue first from a sinking ship, her or the doll, Lee grimaced and groaned, unable to make up his mind. At age eight, he was placed in a special education system in the US, where he started playing ice hockey as a sports therapy. Six years later, he turned to golf, which he had been practising during summer vacations.

MUSCLE MOVEMENT

Autistic golfers are not completely unprecedented. Moe Norman, who won 55 Canadian Tour and other Canadian events from the 1950s to the 1970s, is believed to have suffered from

the disorder. A metronomically reliable hitter of the ball, he has been described as "a supernaturally gifted yet cruelly misunderstood athlete".

Lee is cognitively impaired, but has a remarkable rote memory and his motor skills appear to be highly developed, according to his golf coach Kim Jong-Pil. "I think he was born as a golfer," he said.

When they started working together, teaching him was harder than instructing 20 normal athletes at the same time, Kim said. "As he has trouble communicating, I had to teach him with actions and poses, not by words, showing him every right pose and proper muscle movement and fixing his own by touching him," he said.

Etiquette was another challenge, with Lee not understanding why he should stay quiet when other players were teeing off. But once he learned the ropes, he never looked back. "All I worry now is he is practising too hard," said the coach. But Lee's autism may act as an advantage in competition, he said, when pressure can adversely affect performance. "Unlike ordinary athletes, he is not so tense in matches and his concentration remains high throughout a round," Kim said. Lee's caddy Kim Bong-Sub, also a professional golfer, said Lee is especially strong in approach shots and putting, but has trouble making decisions-often the case with autistics-such as whether to lob the ball or roll it towards the hole.

MAKING THE CUT

Golf is hugely popular in South Korea, whose women players dominate the global game, taking five of the top seven places on the current LPGA money list. Lee made his debut on the country's professional golf tour at the KPGA Caedo Golden V1 Open in June by invitation. He failed to make the cut, but has secured sponsorship from South Korea's Hana Financial Group - a rarity for someone at his level. "As a patient suffering from developmental disorder, what he has achieved is remarkable indeed," said company spokesman Paul Park. Lee's mother Bahk Jiae said she hoped to see her son set an example as a successful athlete with a disability.

"We all hugged with each other and cried" when he qualified for the professional ranks, she said. "I was so moved when he said: 'Mom, thank you. I am sorry for having caused you so much trouble', she said. "I never thought he was able to put his feelings into such phrases." —AFP

INDIA'S 'FAITH RUNNER' FALTERS ON THE FINAL STRAIGHT

—MUMBAI: Tormented by blisters, illness and injuries, Indian ultra-marathoner Samir Singh got to within 36 kilometres of his goal of running 10,000km in 100 days when pain and exhaustion beat him. Singh, dubbed "The Faith Runner" and inevitably compared to Forrest Gump, spent nearly three months running between Mumbai's slums and business district using donated clothes and equipment, and living on just \$3 a day. At the end of his attempt on Sunday, the 5ft 7ins (170cm) running coach, who also suffered stomach problems and viral fever, weighed just 40 kilogrammes (88 pounds). Singh started on April 29 in Mumbai's scorching heat, and has been running

through the monsoon rains without skipping a day. He needed to clock 150km (93 miles) on the final day on Sunday, after falling behind schedule through illness. But the 44-year-old could only complete 114km, falling agonisingly short of his target—which was the equivalent of about a quarter of the Earth's circumference. "He was plagued by gastro-intestinal infections and contracted viral fever but has run 9,964.19 kms in 100 days," Vikram Bhatti, who handled Singh's campaign, told AFP. Dressed in a blue sports vest, Singh started each day in the early hours from the northern Mumbai slums and headed to the business district in the city's south. "My journey of running 100 kilo-

metres per day is very challenging but I wanted to show the endurance limit of human spirit," Singh told AFP ahead of the final run. **RUNNING SORE** Friends mocked the man from Madhya Pradesh state for taking on the challenge, but it became an attempt that caught the public imagination. "I survived without a job for the last nine months and people have come forward and supported me with donations, shoes, clothes and equipment," Singh said. He had a GPS watch, a basic mobile phone for emergencies and 200 rupees (\$3.14) a day. Singh said he particularly enjoyed his meal of rice and spicy

lentils, after every run. The five-time ultra-marathon winner lost 16 kilos (35 pounds) during the challenge as his exertions took their toll. "I have focused on my goals with determination and nurtured my dreams despite cracked heels, fractured joints and legs," Singh said. Singh was spotted one day by Mumbai documentary-makers Vandana and Vikram Bhatti, who christened him 'The Faith Runner'. "We met him on the 47th day of his challenge and were taken aback by his story. So, we have been running a Facebook campaign to create awareness and generate funds for Samir," Vandana Bhatti said. — AFP

AUSSIE OLYMPIC LEGEND BETTY CUTHBERT DEAD

SYDNEY: Australian Olympic icon Betty Cuthbert, the only athlete to ever win gold in the 100m, 200m, and 400m, has died aged 79 after a long battle with multiple sclerosis, officials said yesterday. Cuthbert shot to fame as a little-known 18-year-old at the 1956 Melbourne Olympics, winning the 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay, earning her the nickname "Golden Girl" by local media.

She suffered a hamstring injury at the Rome Games four years later and briefly retired, before being coaxed back to the track to win the 400m at the 1964 Olympics in Tokyo. During her career, she set nine world records, four of them in 1958, and remains the only athlete, male or female, to win Olympic gold in the 100m, 200m and 400m.

Swimmer Ian Thorpe is the only Australian to claim more Olympic gold medals, with five. "Betty was the Golden Girl of the track and a national heroine," said Australian Olympic Committee president John Coates. "It's very sad to lose such a great champion. Betty battled her illness for many years and showed tremendous

courage, but more importantly she always managed to smile."

Athletics Australia president Mark Arbib called her "inspiring". "She is the only athlete, male or female, to win Olympic gold in the 100m, 200m and 400m, with her trophy cabinet also including three medals from the Commonwealth Games," he said.

"She will be forever remembered as a legend of the sport and a trailblazer for our female athletes." Born in Sydney, she moved to West Australia in later life after being diagnosed with multiple sclerosis in 1969, which confined to a wheelchair. She returned to the spotlight in 2000 when she took part in the ceremony to light the cauldron at the Sydney Olympic Games. Cuthbert was an inaugural member of the Athletics Australia Hall of Fame and she was inducted into the IAAF Hall of Fame in 2012.

"Rest in peace Betty Cuthbert-an inspiration and a champion on and off the track," tweeted Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull, while fellow track legend Cathy Freeman said: "Thank you for the inspirational memories, Betty Cuthbert." —AFP

SAVEA DROPPED FROM NZ'S RUGBY CHAMPIONSHIP SQUAD

WELLINGTON: Blockbusting wing Julian Savea has been dropped from the All Blacks with a fit-again Nehe Milner-Skudder back in the frame in a 33-man squad named yesterday for the Rugby Championship.

With the exception of Milner-Skudder and a recall for prop Nepo Laulala, the line-up reflects the frontline players used in the recent drawn series against the British and Irish Lions.

Savea, known as "The Bus" and with 46 tries from 55 Tests, had been a regular in the 11 jersey for the All Blacks since 2012, but he now finds himself dumped on his 27th birthday. He looked in a precarious position when only required for the third Test in the Lions series, and was then relegated to the bench by the Wellington Hurricanes for their Super Rugby semi-final against South Africa's Golden Lions.

Milner-Skudder has been making a rapid return to form after being out of rugby for most of the past two years with injury problems. He last played for the All Blacks in the 2015 World Cup final.

Of the two All Blacks to take off-shore contracts following the Lions Tests, Charlie Faumuina's departure has opened the door for Laulala. But the selectors opted not to replace Aaron Cruden, instead reducing their fly-half ranks to Beauden Barrett and Lima Sopoaga. Damian McKenzie has been named as a replacement for fullback Ben Smith, who will take an extended break from the game following the first two matches.

"For us, it's case of re-establishing ourselves and building on our good work from last year and during the recent Lions series," coach Steve Hansen said.

"There were some clear things learnt in the Lions series and this is a great chance for us to implement those; to continue to grow our skill execution and the mental side of our game, and develop our leadership and the

leadership group."

TRAVEL WORRIES

Hansen said he also had to be mindful of the impact that the Rugby Championship travel, which involves playing in Australia, South Africa and Argentina, would have on the All Blacks' end-of-year northern hemisphere tour. "There is a massive travelling component to the Championship, which comes at a cost at the end of the year, so we'll be looking to implement some new strategies to try and overcome that," he said.

Super Rugby champions Canterbury Crusaders provide the bulk of the squad with 10 players, while there are eight from the Hurricanes, six from the Waikato Chiefs, five Otago Highlanders and four Auckland Blues.

TORI BOWIE - FROM FOSTER CHILD TO FAME

LONDON: Tori Bowie's dream of one day seeing a sign in her home community saying 'welcome to Sand Hill home to Tori Bowie' looks almost certain to be realised after her 100m win at the world athletics championships.

For the sport of athletics the 26-year-old American's victory-courtesy of her habitual hurling herself at the line which denied diminutive Ivorian Marie Josee Ta Lou the gold-will be a welcome antidote to the largely hostile reception of her compatriot and two-time dope cheat Justin Gatlin's win in the men's race the night before.

For Bowie—who finally tasted gold in an individual event after lesser medals in the Olympic 100 and 200m as well as the 2015 100 world final—it will also be a moment of glory shared with her paternal grandmother and her role model, Bobbie Smith.

But for Smith, Bowie says she and her sister Tamara-younger by just under a year—would have been taken on by foster parents. "My mother dropped us off at a foster care centre when I was just two," Bowie told NBC last year.

"But my grandmother ended up fighting for us and winning custody of us. "We didn't have much but she gave us character," added Bowie, who has shortened her name from the unusual Fentorish.

'DON'T THINK OF BOYS'

Smith for her part had no hesitation in assuming her responsibilities to her discarded grand daughters even though she had five children of her own to bring up in the tiny enclave in Mississippi which is so small Bowie says there are no 'stop lights'. She said her own grandmother had taken in six grandchildren, including herself, despite the hardship. "So I knew if she could take in six, I could take in two. That helped motivate me and let me know I could do it," the 70-year-old told the Clarion-Ledger.

Bowie, who has done some modelling and is keen to get into acting with her goal to attract the attention of gospel film legend Tyler Perry, says she and Tamara are eternally cognisant of their grandmother's sacrifices.

"To me, it's like she really hasn't had a life her-

self because she has given her entire life to us," Bowie told MSNnews.com last year. Smith, who is still referred to as 'Mama' by both the sisters, instilled in the two girls from an early age what their priorities should be so they could experience a different life to the impoverished one their parents and she had done.

"I encouraged them to go to school and don't think of boys at young age and they took my advice," she said. Bowie, who says she was a tomboy in her youth going out and playing basketball with her male relations as well as going shooting with them, has shown that on the track and Tamarra, whilst a talented athlete in her own right, is studying law.

Smith for her part is especially proud of how the two girls have turned out. "It makes me think about no matter how bad things can get or start in your life or be in your life, it's still good things that can come out of it," she told WBTV. Bowie, who is also determined to emulate her grandmother's example in taking disadvantaged children under her wing and encouraging them that they can succeed, is mindful of another piece of advice Smith gave them.

"My grandmother told me a long time ago, 'I don't care if you're sweeping a porch for a living. She said, you need to do your best.' "So I've lived by that every single day," Bowie told WBTV.— AFP

N ZEALAND'S WALSH DEPOSES CHAMPION KOVACS IN SHOT

LONDON: Tomas Walsh of New Zealand won the men's shot put world title on Sunday with a stunning series of throws climaxing with a best of 22.03 metres. The 25-year-old-a former builder which he credits for his body strength edged out America's defending champion Joe Kovacs, who posted a best of 21.66.

"To pull it out on the last one is awesome," said Walsh, who revealed he had been undergoing treatment on his groin prior to the final. "I knew that (Olympic champion) Ryan Crouser was going to attack on the last attempt and it is so special for me to know that I was able to attack, too.

"Whether it was a fierce throw or not, I tried my hardest in the last throw and it worked. I did not want to do 22m in the qualification

and then lose it in the final." There was a heated finale, though, when Kovacs's final throw, that appeared to be over 22m, was ruled out by a red flag.

He demanded an explanation but there was to be no going back on the decision as his trailing foot clipped the board as he launched the shot. However, with the heat of battle having cooled Kovacs was satisfied with his silver although he took added satisfaction that he would have won if the throw had been allowed. "I am happy to get on the podium, of course, but I was ready to come back for the gold," he said. "My last throw, which I did protest, was long enough to win. Despite the result of the protest, I am just glad it was enough to win."

Croatia's Stipe Zunic took the bronze with 21.46m whilst there was crushing disappointment for Crouser, who could finish only sixth with 21.20m. Walsh pumped the air with his fist after his second throw and he had good reason to as he took the lead from Kovacs, who had hurled his shot out to 21.46.

Walsh consolidated his lead with his third effort recording a mark of 21.75m but things weren't going well for Crouser, who slipped to fifth by the third round. The American's third effort was a massive throw but it was ruled a foul. The pressure increased on Crouser as his fourth throw also resulted in a foul and he went into the sixth and final round in sixth spot. However, there was to be no grandstand finale for the 24-year-old. — AFP

WIETERS HITS GRAND SLAM AS NATIONALS BEAT CUBS

CHICAGO: Matt Wieters hit a tiebreaking grand slam off Carl Edwards Jr. in Washington's five-run eighth inning, helping the Nationals beat the Chicago Cubs 9-4 on Sunday. Bryce Harper started the winning rally with a one-out infield single against Mike Montgomery. Ryan Zimmerman doubled against Edwards and Daniel Murphy was walked intentionally to load the bases. Washington then grabbed control in a span of two pitches. Edwards (3-3) hit Anthony Rendon, tying it at 4, and Wieters followed with a drive over the wall in center for his third career grand slam. Wieters drove in five runs and Brian Goodwin homered for the NL East-leading Nationals, who had dropped three of four. Willson Contreras homered twice for NL Central-leading Chicago. Brandon Kintzler (3-2) pitched a scoreless inning for his first win since he was acquired in a trade with Minnesota.

YANKEES 8, INDIANS 1

Luis Severino overpowered Cleveland's lineup into the seventh inning, Jacoby Ellsbury hit a three-run triple and rookie Aaron Judge hammered a three-run homer, sending the Yankees to a win over the Indians. Severino (9-4) gave up Michael Brantley's homer in the first and then toyed with the Indians, striking out nine and allowing just three runners to reach. He didn't give up his second hit until there were two outs in the seventh and was pulled by manager Joe Girardi before getting a roaring ovation from several thousand New York fans. The All-Star right-hander is 4-0 with a 0.71 ERA in his last four starts. Ellsbury's triple came in New York's five-run sixth off Carlos Carrasco (10-5), and Judge connected in the seventh for his 35th homer - only No. 5 since the All-Star break - to give New York an 8-1 lead.

ASTROS 7, BLUE JAYS 6

Juan Centeno hit an RBI single with two outs that capped a four-run rally in the ninth inning, lifting the Astros over the Blue Jays. Jose Altuve singled off All-Star closer Roberto Osuna (3-3) to begin the Houston ninth and one-out singles by Yuli Gurriel and Marwin Gonzalez loaded the bases. Carlos Beltran

grounded into a forceout that scored a run, and Alex Bregman hit a tying, two-run triple. Centeno followed with a liner over the head of leaping first baseman Justin Smoak and into shallow right field to win it for the AL West leaders. Nori Aoki had a two-run homer, his first hit since being traded from Houston to Toronto last Monday, during a four-run seventh that gave the Blue Jays a 6-3 lead. Francis Martes (4-1) pitched 1 2/3 scoreless innings for the win. Osuna allowed five hits and four runs while getting only two outs for his seventh blown save this season.

The Cardinals took two of three in the series. They're 5-8 against Cincinnati this season. St. Louis sent 13 batters to the plate for nine runs in the fourth, matching its biggest inning of the season. Martinez connected off Homer Bailey (3-6), who gave up a career-high 10 runs in only 3 1/3 innings. Bailey has been hit hard in his return from surgery to remove bone spurs from his pitching elbow last February. The Cardinals overcame a rugged first inning by Wainwright, who had spent the last 12 days on the DL with a stiff back. Joey Votto hit a three-run homer, and Wainwright threw 39 pitches before retiring a batter. Wainwright left after three innings and 88 pitches. Brett Cecil (2-4) allowed three hits in three innings for the win.

RAYS 2, BREWERS 1

Steven Souza Jr. homered off Milwaukee reliever Jacob Barnes leading off the ninth inning Sunday to lift the Rays to a win over the Brewers. Souza's 24th home run helped the Rays salvage a win in a three-game series in which they scored only two runs. It was Souza's first walkoff homer with the Rays. Most of the game was a pitchers' duel between the Rays' Chris Archer and the Brewers' Jimmy Nelson. Tommy Hunter (1-2) got the win after tossing 1 1/3 innings of relief. Barnes (3-3) threw only two pitches in relief of Nelson, who gave up one run on six

hits while striking out nine in eight innings.

OSCAR BAN HARMING CHINA TITLE HOPES: VILLAS-BOAS

SHANGHAI: Andre Villas-Boas fears that the prolonged absence of banned Brazilian star Oscar could torpedo Shanghai SIPG's Chinese Super League title hopes. The Portuguese coach saw his side finish the weekend three points behind leaders Guangzhou Evergrande following a dry 0-0 home draw with third-placed Tianjin Quanjian on Sunday.

Both sides failed to create many chances during an ill-tempered game and Villas-Boas was left to rue the absence of attacking midfielder Oscar,

the Asian-record, 60-million-euro man who is reaching the end of an eight-game ban for triggering a brawl in a CSL game in June.

Oscar returns this month but former Chelsea and Tottenham Hotspur manager Villas-Boas believes it is no coincidence that his team has hit a rough patch of form during the player's lengthy suspension.

"It was the decision by the CFA (Chinese Football Association) to suspend one of the best players in the world for eight games, so what can we

do?" a clearly frustrated Villas-Boas asked after the game.

"Of course we miss Oscar. It's been a long spell without him... it's just too much. "We brought him for a reason. We ended up loaning one of the most creative players last season, (the Argentine Dario) Conca, to Brazil and creativity is one of the things of my teams and of course we miss players of his calibre.

"Our bad spell responds to the fact that we had Oscar suspended for eight games." The CFA banned Oscar after accusing him of sparking an all-out

brawl against Guangzhou R&F when he appeared to deliberately fire the ball at an opposing player.

In seven league games since, Shanghai have won only three times. Reigning champions Guangzhou Evergrande have also stumbled, but they beat Tianjin Teda 3-0 on Saturday after a sticky run to stay in the driving seat with just over half the CSL season gone.

Villas-Boas and Fabio Cannavaro, his opposite number at Tianjin Quanjian, were unhappy with some of the officiat-

ing in Sunday's stalemate. Shanghai's bruising forward Hulk and Tianjin's Alexandre Pato-two Brazilian internationals-were at the centre of a series of run-ins between the two sides.

Villas-Boas, already banned this season for two games for criticising the Oscar suspension, and Italy's Cannavaro both declined to elaborate on their grievances, fearing CFA punishment.

"I prefer not to answer because it can be controversial," the Portuguese said, when asked by AFP if he felt that the away side had targeted Hulk. — AFP

NEYMAR NOT BIGGER THAN BARCA: PRESIDENT

BARCELONA: Barcelona president Josep Maria Bartomeu insisted no player is bigger than the Catalan giants yesterday in the wake of Neymar's world record 222 million euro (\$264 million) move to Paris Saint-Germain. Bartomeu and his board are under pressure to wisely reinvest the huge sum, which more than doubled the previous record for a transfer fee, before the transfer window closes on August 31. "No player is above Barca," Bartomeu told the world congress of Barca supporters groups.

"You know that Neymar formed part of the success of our club, but Neymar is now history. He wanted to go. It was his decision although we did everything in our hands for him to stay." Barca were powerless to stop Neymar leaving after PSG met the buyout clause in the Brazilian's contract, which he had signed just last year.

However, Bartomeu defended himself from criticism that the club should have insisted on inserting a much higher buyout clause in that deal to fend off PSG's millions. Neymar's clause rose from 200 to 222

million from July 1 and would have jumped to 250 million had he entered the third year of the five-year deal.

"We foresaw that he could leave in the future, that is why we raised his buyout clause in the new contract," added Bartomeu. "Receiving this money allows us to face the future with guarantees to strengthen the team.

"When the doubts over his future began we were calm because his decision would be a good one "If he stayed we would maintain a great player and if he went, obviously paying his clause, we had the guarantee of being able to bring new players." Barca have been linked with a series of potential replacements for Neymar with Liverpool's Philippe Coutinho heading their wish list. Yet, Bartomeu promised to be act with "prudence" despite having to deal in a transfer market characterised by hyperinflation due to booming television rights deals. "The 222 million euros that we received for Neymar Jr will be administered with prudence, rigour and serenity," he said. —AFP

BIG-SPENDING GUARDIOLA LEADS CHASE OF CHELSEA

LONDON: Empowered by a close-season transfer splurge of some £200 million (\$264.8 million, 233.5 million euros), Manchester City are the early favourites to topple Premier League champions Chelsea. Pep Guardiola endured a bruising first season in English football as City failed to challenge for the title, eventually finishing 15 points adrift of Chelsea in third place.

The club reacted with a glut of new signings-three new full-backs in Kyle Walker, Benjamin Mendy and Danilo, plus goalkeeper Ederson and playmaker Bernardo Silva-and now look a force to be reckoned with.

"I think Manchester City are the team to beat," said Manchester United great Ryan Giggs in a recent Sky Sports column. "I looked at them towards the end of last season and the forward players they've got is scary." While City shimmered in attack, they frequently looked vulnerable in defence and resculpting the back four has been Guardiola's main priority. Brazilian Ederson replaces the error-prone Claudio Bravo in goal, while dynamic pair Walker and Mendy will add thrust on the flanks after becoming the world's two most expensive defenders.

City also have John Stones and Elikuim Mangala on their books, giving them four of the most expensive defenders ever, but with total spending in the league having exceeded £900 million, Guardiola is unrepentant. "I would like to pay less for the club, for everybody, but the market is the market," said the City manager. "All the clubs spend a lot of money-not just us."

MOURINHO'S SECOND SEASON

Across town at Manchester United, Guardiola's old sparring partner Jose Mourinho is also looking to kick on after ending a difficult debut season with a silver flourish.

United finished outside the top four for the third time in four seasons, but secured a Champions League berth by winning the Europa League and also tasted glory in the League Cup.

Mourinho's teams traditionally peak in his second season and he has strengthened in each department with the acquisitions of Victor Lindelof, Nemanja Matic and Romelu Lukaku. Mourinho won the league in his second seasons at Porto, Real Madrid and Inter Milan, as well as in both of his stints at Chelsea, but he expects this season's title race to be an almighty scrap.

"Normally the second season should be

better than the first, but again, this is modern football. The reality is totally different," he told ESPN.

"It's getting much harder for everyone, so we don't know." Chelsea, the champions, have thus far failed to significantly enhance a squad that now faces the twin rigours of a league title defence and Champions League campaign. Alvaro Morata has replaced the exiled Diego Costa up front, Tiemoue Bakayoko has taken Matic's place in midfield and Antonio Rudiger brings extra defensive cover, but Chelsea still look a few players short.

In the meantime, manager Antonio Conte says his main priority is to avoid what he has saltily called "the Mourinho season" in reference to the 10th-place finish that followed Chelsea's 2015 title win.

AMBITIOUS EVERTON

Chelsea were sensationally upstaged by Arsenal in last season's FA Cup final and lost to them again in Sunday's Community Shield, but Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger retains little margin for error.

While Wenger has pulled off the big-name signing of Alexandre Lacazette from Lyon, Alexis Sanchez and Mesut Ozil are now in the last years of their contracts and fan dissent will quickly return if results go awry. Mauricio Pochettino's Tottenham Hotspur are trusting in the same formula that swept them to second place last season and must adapt to a new temporary home at Wembley while White Hart Lane is rebuilt. Fourth last season, Liverpool have signed relatively modestly, adding Mohamed Salah, Dominic Solanke and Andrew Robertson to their ranks.

Both Jurgen Klopp's team and their title rivals will be mindful of the menace posed by Everton, whose ambitious transfer dealings articulate their determination to crash the top six.

Everton have splashed out on young English talents like Jordan Pickford and Michael Keane, as well as bringing Wayne Rooney back to the club after his record-breaking 13-year spell at Manchester United.

Having secured promotion from the Championship alongside Newcastle United, Brighton and Hove Albion and Huddersfield Town return to the top flight for the first time in 34 and 45 years respectively. In a novelty for the 2017-18 season, players suspected of diving will face retrospective disciplinary action that could result in two-game suspensions. — AFP

REAL READY TO GO WITHOUT RONALDO AGAINST MAN UTD

SKOPJE: Cristiano Ronaldo has finally returned to training with Real Madrid but the defending European champions are set to be without the Portuguese superstar in today's UEFA Super Cup clash with Manchester United in Skopje.

Ronaldo's summer has been overshadowed by accusations of tax evasion in Spain, which led to him being charged in a court near Madrid last week, while he was handed an extended summer break by his club after playing for Portugal at the Confederations Cup.

He only returned to training at the weekend, meaning it would be a major surprise if coach Zinedine Zidane were to include the 32-year-old against his former club in the match at the Philip II Arena in the Macedonian capital.

"He needed to rest. He has had his holidays and that was important," said Zidane of the man whose two goals helped propel Madrid to a 4-1 victory over Juventus in the Champions League final in Cardiff two months ago.

That victory saw Real become the first club to retain the trophy in the Champions League era and completed a glorious campaign in which they also won La Liga.

The season started with a 3-2 extra-time triumph against Sevilla in the Super Cup in the Norwegian city of Trondheim.

"Real Madrid is a team, a club, an institution that has hunger. We all know where we are and when you finish a season like last year winning, it helps you try to do the same thing coming into the new season," Zidane-whose team have Barcelona to come at the weekend in the Spanish Super Cup-said in a UEFA interview.

However, his side failed to record a victory during a pre-season tour of the United States that included a high-profile friendly encounter with Jose Mourinho's United in Santa Clara, California.

That International Champions Cup encounter ended in a 1-1 draw before United won on penalties. While the Spaniards have made two relatively low-key summer signings in Dani Ceballos from Betis and Theo Hernandez from Atletico Madrid, United have spent big ahead of their return to the Champions League.

The Europa League winners have added the defender Victor Lindelof from Benfica, the midfielder Nemanja Matic from Chelsea and Everton striker Romelu Lukaku and they wrapped up their preparations with a 2-1 win over Sampdoria in Dublin.

MOURINHO PLAYS DOWN REUNION

This match offers a chance for United to start

the new campaign on a high before their opening Premier League game against West Ham United next Sunday.

In a glittering career Mourinho has not yet won the Super Cup-his Chelsea team lost on penalties to Bayern Munich in the 2013 edition.

The Portuguese is coming up against the club he coached for three years until 2013 — he did not leave the Spanish capital on the best of terms but he insisted that experience is not on his mind this week. "It's something I've been through many times. I left Porto and two months later I was facing them in the Champions League," he told UEFA.com.

"I left Chelsea and a few months later I was facing them with Manchester United. I never look at it in terms of taking on my former club, not at all. So I just look at Real Madrid as what they are: a big club, the European champions, and it's a great motivation for us to play against them." This annual meeting of the European champions and Europa League winners comes to the Balkan state after going to Prague, Cardiff, Tbilisi and Trondheim in recent years.

But in contrast to the cool conditions in Norway 12 months ago, temperatures in Skopje are expected to reach 40 degrees for much of the week. — AFP

ALI BOWLS ENGLAND TO SOUTH AFRICA SERIES WIN

MANCHESTER: Moeen Ali finished a brilliant campaign with a five-wicket haul as England beat South Africa by 177 runs in the fourth Test at Old Trafford yesterday to seal a 3-1 series win. Victory, achieved with more than a day to spare, also saw Joe Root triumphant in his first Test series as England captain. South Africa, set a huge 380 for victory, were bowled out for 202 shortly after tea on the fourth day when Ali took two wickets in two balls to remove Morne Morkel and Duanne Olivier.

That gave the off-spinner a return of five for 69 in 19.5 overs and 25 wickets in total in a series where he also scored 252 runs. This result meant England had won their first home Test series against South Africa since 1998. It was also just South Africa's second defeat in 20 away Test series, their other overseas campaign reverse in that sequence coming against India in 2015/16.

South Africa, 43 for three at lunch, saw Hashim Amla (83) and captain Faf du Plessis (61)

put on 123 for the fourth wicket. But Ali then took three wickets for five runs in 11 balls—including the prize scalp of Amla—as the Proteas collapsed from 163 for three to 173 for six.

Earlier, Ali, both the man-of-the-match and the man of the series, made 75 not out off just 66 balls in England's second innings 243, having been dropped on 15. That left South Africa facing a mammoth chase, with no side having made more to win in the fourth innings of a Test at Old Trafford than England's 294 for four against New Zealand in 2008.

South Africa's already difficult task was not helped when they lost both openers, leaving them at 18 for two. Dean Elgar, who made a gritty second-innings hundred in England's 239-run victory in the third Test at The Oval, fell for five on Monday when caught behind off Stuart Broad.

Heino Kuhn, struggling to cement his Test place, repeatedly played and missed before, on 11, edging James Anderson, again bowling from

the newly-named James Anderson End, to Cook. Temba Bavuma again battled hard until, from the last ball before lunch, he was given out caught behind on review off Toby Roland-Jones. Amla completed a 100-ball fifty with his ninth four, a pull off Ben Stokes. He then twice forced Stokes off the back foot for two stylish offside fours before driving Ali for six.

But with South Africa 163 for three, Amla missed an intended whip shot off Ali and was lbw, although England, for the second time yesterday, had to first review umpire Kumar Dharmasena's original not out decision.

No replays were required when Quinton de Kock (one) edged a drive off Ali to Alastair Cook in the slips. And 173 for five became 173 for six when Theunis de Bruyn fell for a duck, nicking Ali to slip fielder Stokes.

The end came quickly for South Africa, 182 for six at tea. Du Plessis, who played at Old Trafford for Lancashire, had added just one to his tea score when he was caught behind off

Anderson, England's all-time leading Test wicket-taker. Anderson, who finished with three for 16, then had Kagiso Rabada caught in the covers. Ali,

appropriately, finished the match with Morkel holding out for a duck before Olivier, also out for nought, was taken by Stokes at slip. —AFP

MADISON KEYS OUTSLUGS COCO TO WIN AT STANFORD

STANFORD: Madison Keys and CoCo Vandeweghe had never played on opposite sides of the net, just together on Fed Cup for the US, bonding and becoming friends during that extended stay in Australia in April last year.

They sure put on an entertaining show of tennis when they finally faced off for the first time Sunday. Third-seeded Keys outslugged No. 6 Vandeweghe 7-6 (4), 6-4 to win the Bank of the West Classic in a thrilling display of power and serving by the two young American stars in their first career matchup. Afterward, they hugged and Keys playfully sat on her opponent's lap. Keys couldn't quite believe it took them this long to meet up in a match that mattered. She won her third career singles title and first on hardcourt playing under cloudless skies at Stanford. The champ finally got her chance by rallying back to deuce in the ninth game of the second set, when Vandeweghe surrendered her first service game after she saved two break points moments earlier. Vandeweghe hadn't dropped a set all tournament until the final.

"It feels amazing to have a title at home and on hardcourt," Keys said. "It means a lot. It's my first title in the States against a friend." After smacking a clean crosscourt forehand winner on

match point, Keys raised her hands in the air in triumph then gave Vandeweghe a hug at the net before waving to the crowd. Keys stayed after the trophy ceremony to sign autographs. Keys, who missed the first two months of the season following surgery on her left wrist, eliminated Wimbledon champion and top-seeded Garbine Muguruza 6-3, 6-2 in just 57 minutes Saturday night to snap Muguruza's nine-match winning streak and advance to her first final this year.

A day later, Keys needed nearly that amount of time to win the first-set tiebreaker: The opening set lasted 53 minutes then the second just 35. Keys brilliantly returned serve and routinely pumped in her own serves from 114-118 mph to keep Vandeweghe on the defensive.

There were times during her wrist rehab she wondered if her tennis would ever return to top form. These two generate so much power from their tall frames. Vandeweghe is 6 foot 1 and Keys stands 5 foot 10. "It was a high quality match from both players," Vandeweghe said. "It was definitely a really tight two-set match. It was fun to play. It was fun to kind of play a friend and have an all-American final. —AP

SIZZLING ZVEREV TAKES FOURTH TITLE OF THE YEAR

WASHINGTON: Alexander Zverev issued a warning to top ATP rivals Sunday after winning the Citi Open for his fourth title of the year—he's not the next generation, he's the now generation. The 20-year-old German defeated South Africa's Kevin Anderson 6-4, 6-4 to capture the \$355,460 (302,000 euros) top prize at the US Open tuneup event on the Washington hardcourts. World number eight Zverev dropped only nine points on his serve and never faced a break point in becoming the youngest player to win four ATP titles in a year, or take the Washington crown, since Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro did it at 19 in 2008.

"I improved a lot in the last few months to get where I can win tournaments," Zverev said. "The longer the tournament goes for me the better I'm able to play. Hopefully this can continue to be like that." Zverev won his first title last September in St. Petersburg and added trophies this year at Montpellier, Munich and Rome, where he downed Novak Djokovic in the final. He also ousted number four Stan Wawrinka at Miami and pushed Rafael Nadal to five sets in the third round of the Australian Open.

"I'm 'Next Gen' but the rankings say it for themselves," Zverev said. "I think I showed I can play with the big guys this year. 'I think I showed I'm not an 'in the future' kind of guy. I'm right now."

Only Wimbledon and Australian Open champion Roger Federer with five titles has won more ATP crowns this year than Zverev, and that's only because the Swiss star handed the German his lone finals loss of 2017 at Halle in June. "A lot of people are looking at him as the face of tennis and the next Grand Slam champion," Anderson said of Zverev. "He seems to deal with it all pretty well. It will be interesting to see how the next little while progresses.

"I wouldn't be surprised if he wins a

few Grand Slams. He definitely seems to be on a path in that direction." Zverev, who will remain a career-best eighth in Monday's rankings, made a Slam-best fourth-round Wimbledon run, losing in five sets to Milos Raonic.

MAKAROVA WINS WOMEN'S TITLE

"Winning those types of matches is the next level I need to reach," Zverev said. "To get far in those events is my next goal." Zverev thanked new co-coach Juan Carlos Ferrero, the former world number one from Spain who worked with him at an event for the first time this week.

"What a way to start together and hopefully we have many more years to come and many more titles together," Zverev said. "It's amazing what we've already accomplished."

Russia's 58th-ranked Ekaterina Makarova prevented a German title sweep by rallying past 40th-ranked Julia Goerges 3-6, 7-6 (7/2), 6-0 for her third career WTA crown. "I was dreaming to win this tournament and I'm so happy," Makarova said.

Makarova hadn't won a title since 2014 in Pattaya City. Her first WTA trophy came at Eastbourne in 2010. —AFP

RENAULT SIGNS 660M EURO DEAL WITH IRAN
LONG-AWAITED JV PLANS TO BUILD UP TO 300,000 CARS PER YEAR

TEHRAN: French automaker Renault signed yesterday a long-awaited joint venture deal with Iran worth 660 million euros (\$779 million) to build up to 300,000 cars per year. The new deal puts Renault in partnership with Iran's state Industrial Development and Renovation Organization (IDRO) and private firm Parto Negin Naseh. Renault will hold a 60-percent stake with IDRO and Parto Negin Naseh 20 percent each.

"The first phase of this accord worth 660 million euros provides for the annual manufacturing of 150,000 cars," IDRO head Mansour Moazami said at a signing ceremony in Tehran.

He said the first cars will roll off the assembly line in around 18 months. The new venture will produce Renault's Duster and Symbol models at a refurbished factory in Saveh, around 120 kilometres (74 miles) southwest of Tehran. A second, three-year phase will start in 2019 with production ramping up to 300,000 cars per year.

Under the deal, 30 percent of the cars and parts made by the venture will be exported. "We are happy to

sign one of Renault's most historical contracts here," said Thierry Bollore, number two of the French carmaker, at the signing.

"Within Renault, Iran is known for its great industrial potential, its automotive industry infrastructure, strong human resources and unique geopolitical position," he added.

Unlike its chief competitor PSA, which makes Peugeots and Citroens, Renault never fully quit Iran during the sanctions period and already makes some 200,000 cars a year in the country.

But it had to put a brake on its growth plans until Iran concluded a nuclear deal with world powers that came into force in January 2016, easing international sanctions.

"Renault has proved its commitment with a nonstop presence in Iran since the beginning of its operation in 2004, and this signing confirms our strong intent and commitment for long-term operations as a strategic partner of Iran's automotive industry," said Bollore.

"This is a unique agreement in terms of investment, of technology

transfer... of the development of Iranian talent, and in the creation of a modern engineering and production centre," he added. Negotiations were painstaking, with Renault reportedly reluctant to meet Iranian requirements to source 40 percent of their parts from local manufacturers, which have struggled to keep up with international standards.

PSA, which quit the country when international sanctions hit in 2012, has been quick to rebuild its presence in Iran, which was the company's main engine of growth last year.

It signed a 400-million-euro deal in June 2016 to build 200,000 Peugeots a year with Iran Khodro, and another with Iran's SAIPA to build a similar number of Citroens. Overall production in Iran is expected to reach two million cars a year by 2020, up from 1.2 million in 2016.

French firms have been at the forefront of rebuilding trade ties with Iran since the nuclear deal, with energy giant Total signing a billion-dollar gas deal last month despite mounting pressure from Washington to isolate the country. —AFP

CASH CRISIS PUSHES LIBYANS TO VIRTUAL PAYMENTS SYSTEMS

BENGHAZI: When a cash crisis struck the war-torn North African country of Libya, many people were forced to queue for days to withdraw their savings. But electronic payment systems set up to tackle the dearth of cash have struggled to gain credibility amid accusations of abuse.

Said Fayed Fadhallah, 35, uses a mobile phone app to pay for a trolley-full of groceries at a large supermarket in second city Benghazi. "Now I don't have to spend hours or even days queuing at the bank to withdraw cash," he said. "They really solved a problem for us."

Years of violence and political chaos since a 2011 NATO-backed uprising that toppled and killed longtime dictator Muammar Gaddafi have left Libya's state institutions in crisis-including the central bank. In 2014 it split into two, with the different branches overseen by rival governments in the west and east. The resulting cash crisis, fuelled by spiraling inflation, caused huge queues to form at the banks and left many people unable to access their salaries.

In response, the banks have launched electronic payment systems. In Benghazi, the Bank of Commerce & Development's "Edfali" (Arabic for "pay me") and Wahda Bank's "MobiCash" allow users to buy goods,

pay restaurant bills and access pharmacies and hospitals.

But not everyone is happy. At the exit of the same Benghazi supermarket, his arms full of produce, Ayman Al-Obeidi, 46, said the new payment systems were not working. "We were told... that prices would remain unchanged" compared with cash prices, he said. "But we saw a 40 percent increase on payments with Edfali."



Bank rush

Many Libyans have not had free access to their bank accounts since 2014. Braving cold in winter and blistering heat in the summer, they rushed to the banks on hearing rumors of cash deliveries and queued for hours without any guarantee they would be able to access their own money.

The crisis has destroyed public confidence in the financial sector. "People don't trust the

banks anymore," one bank employee told AFP, speaking on condition of anonymity.

"They want to be sure they can get enough cash in case anything happens and the banks close, or if they can't leave their houses." Employees of Libya's vast public service still have their salaries paid directly into their accounts. Many have turned to electronic payment systems to access their money. Such services allow buyers to credit the seller's account. They then receive an SMS message confirming that the transaction has been completed. Wahda Bank's spokesman Al-Motassem Al-Fitouri said transactions via MobiCash are "very secure".

"It is not even necessary to have a smartphone to make payments, nor does the merchant have to have a point-of-sale device," he said. The banks are aware that the services are open to abuse, however. On its website, the BCD encourages customers to report price hikes on payments via "Edfali". And many businesses that were enthusiastic at first have since dropped the service. Salah Al-Agouri, a businessman whose clients pay him using Edfali, is critical. "The bank did not respect its commitments," he said. "It assured us that we would be able to withdraw cash to the value of 25 percent of sales via this service, but that wasn't the case." —AFP

UAE OIL FIRM IN TALKS OVER OFFSHORE OIL STAKES

DUBAI: The United Arab Emirates' main state oil company says it plans to divvy up its offshore oil operations and is in "advanced discussions" with multiple companies interested in stakes.

The Abu Dhabi National Oil Company said yesterday that more than a dozen companies are involved in the talks, and that they include both existing partners and new firms. It did not name them.

International shareholders with existing stakes in offshore fields include BP, Total and Exxon Mobil.

ADNOC plans to split its offshore oil concessions into two or more separate operations and will retain a 60 percent stake in the fields.

ADNOC last month announced plans to create joint ventures with international investors and may float some shares in an effort to raise billions of dollars. —AP

REAL ESTATE PRICES STABILIZE, BUT VOLATILITY REMAINS

NBK ECONOMIC REPORT

KUWAIT: Increased volatility in real estate activity dominated the first half of 2017 amid steady prices. Despite some volatility, market activity improved significantly during the first half of the year compared to 2H16, though it remained down 10 percent compared to a year before. Improved activity was particularly visible in the residential sector. This also helped keep real estate prices mostly steady during 1H17.

Activity in June experienced the usual slowdown from the start of summer and the holy month of Ramadan. June sales eased to KD 163.6 million, down 14.6 percent year-on-year (y/y). The annual decline was mostly due to weakness in

the investment and commercial sectors; however, residential sector activity mitigated further weakness with healthy activity despite the seasonal factors. Real estate price indices continue to hover around their six month averages, except for the residential land price index that has retreated somewhat.

The residential sector maintained a solid performance that supported overall activity in June, with revived interest in residential plots. Growing at 15.7 percent y/y, residential sales amounted to KD 102 million in total on 308 transactions. 161 plot sales were recorded during the month, an 85 percent increase from the previous year; most activity was in Abu

Ftaira and Al-Salam areas. During 1H17, 757 residential plots were sold compared to 629 plots for the same period last year.

Residential home prices remain steady as residential land prices ease slightly. The NBK residential home price index stood at 151.8 in June, flat for the month once again; the contraction from a year ago was the slowest in thirteen months at 7.7 percent y/y. The NBK residential land index eased to 162.9 in June from 168.0 in May, dragged down by a bulk sale of 49 plots at a relatively lower market price; the pace of decline from a year ago remained steady at 10-12 percent y/y, a pace that was sustained during the last three months.

Investment sector

The investment sector continues to underperform despite the short-lived surge in activity in May. Sector sales totaled KD 50.8 million, down 30.8 percent y/y. The number of transactions was also down by 25 percent y/y to 74. Apartment sales continue to carry the investment sector during the current environment. Single apartments bought for investment represented 61 percent of total transactions.

The NBK investment building price index remained steady in June. The index came in at 190.1 down only 5.6 percent y/y, an improvement from the double-digit decline rates recorded the previous

year. Housing inflation and investment prices align after the recent inflation revision to the CPI. The rise in vacant apartments and the slowdown in market activity have exercised downward pressure on rents that was not visible in the inflation data until recently. The revision of the consumer price index, which showed housing rents down 2.3 percent y/y for June were more in line with real estate prices and activity.

The commercial sector posted the lowest activity since October 2016 with total sales amounting to just KD 10.9 million. Four transactions were recorded in June, the largest being a commercial plot in Qibla for KD 4.95 million.

ANOTHER MILESTONE FOR STOCKS: MOST BORING MARKET IN DECADES

WALL STREET OVERVIEW

NEW YORK: This year's run to a record for the stock market has been one of the least eventful in decades. Just don't get too comfortable. Only twice this year have investors had to deal with a 1 percent drop for the Standard & Poor's 500 index in a day. That's far fewer than typical. The last time stocks sailed through such an uneventful first seven months was when a group of burglars was arrested for breaking into the Watergate complex in 1972. Broaden the scope to include when the S&P 500 fell or rose by 1 percent in a day, and this could be the least volatile year for stocks since 1964, if the current pace holds.

But as central banks start to wean markets off the stimulus they've injected into the global economy, many money managers say they're preparing for a bumpy ride ahead. For now, markets have been so calm that the biggest loss for the S&P 500 last week was just 0.2 percent. Compare that to the whiplash investors felt during the summer of 2011, when the S&P 500 swung by more than 4 percent each day during one four-day stretch. Investors fortunate enough to be in the market have enjoyed all the upside of owning stocks with almost none of the traditional downside. Stocks are supposed to be volatile, and investors have long accepted that having to stomach big swings in price is one of the costs of owning them. But the largest stock fund by assets, Vanguard's Total Stock Market Index fund, has already returned 11 percent in 2017 with only a few big down days.

Surprising

"At the surface, it is surprising" how calm stocks have been, said Greg Davis, Vanguard's chief investment officer. "But it's not surprising if you think about a world where central banks have been unbelievably accommodative. I think investors still think central banks will step in if there's any stress in the financial markets."

The Federal Reserve and other central banks around the world have slashed interest rates and thrown trillions of dollars of stimulus at the global economy since the 2008 financial crisis. Not only that, profits for S&P 500 companies started growing again late last year, inflation remains low and economies around the world finally seem to be in a synchronized move higher. All that has helped convince investors to step in as

buyers whenever stocks seem vulnerable to a slide, which keeps markets smooth. But the Fed is now slowly moving in the opposite direction: It has raised short-term rates modestly three times in the last year. The central bank also expects to begin paring its vast portfolio of bond investments "relatively soon." Investors on both sides of the Atlantic, meanwhile, are handicapping how long it will be before the European Central Bank pulls back on its bond-buying program.

That could force a return to more typical levels of volatility. Over the last half century, the S&P 500 has had a median 26 days where it fell by at least 1 percent during a year. The worry is that the stock market may not only get back to that level but overshoot it. Stocks are pricier, which raises the risk: One popular measure that compares stock prices to corporate earnings over the prior 10 years says the S&P 500 is at its most expensive level since the dot-com bubble in 2001.

If central banks aren't the trigger to reawaken market volatility, analysts say it could be anything that comes as a big surprise to investors, such as a natural disaster, international conflict or unexpected drop in corporate profits.

In a recent survey of investment managers at

about 100 firms by Northern Trust Asset Management, 63 percent called the market's lack of volatility a warning sign that may lead to a sell-off for stocks. That's even though half the respondents expect corporate profit growth to increase, and most forecast stable economic growth, conditions that are typically favorable for the stock market.

"Volatility is so low, and so much hope is baked into current prices, that it has the potential to disappoint," said Rob McIver, portfolio manager at Jensen Investment Management. Of course, stocks have remained calm this year even in the face of some typically unnerving events. Washington has been unable so far to meet the big expectations investors had at the start of the year for pro-business reforms. North Korea had its first successful test of an intercontinental ballistic missile.

The price of oil is still bouncing up and down. Strategists at BlackRock, the world's largest asset manager, say they think the calm market is partly a result of how unusually stable growth has been for the economy and that the market can remain unruffled as long as the economy holds up. —AP

STRONG EURO WORRIES EUROPE'S EXPORTERS, BUT LITTLE RISK SEEN

PARIS: Some European exporters are beginning to worry about the strengthening euro which has rebounded from near parity with the dollar after Donald Trump's election, though analysts see little immediate risk to growth.

Europe's single currency surged on Wednesday to \$1.1910, its highest level since early January 2015, before retreating to \$1.1770 late Friday. For European businesses heavily reliant on exports, especially in Italy and France, the strong euro could hurt the bottom line.

"There's a general nervousness that this strong euro is beginning to impact European corporate profits—we are starting to see it in this quarter's results," William Hamlyn, investment analyst at Manulife Asset Management, told AFP.

Still many analysts say economic fundamentals are in favor of the euro, compared to the weak dollar and the feeble pound which has been hammered ever since Britain voted last year to exit the European Union. And the impact of a strong euro is different depending on the country. Germany, Europe's biggest economy, has nothing to fear for the moment, said Berenberg Bank economist Holger Schmieding, noting the euro is still far from its long term equilibrium rate of \$1.25.

Only about a quarter of German exports are pegged to the dollar, said Ilya Nothnagel, International expert at the German chambers of commerce DIHK.

Italy would be the country "most affected by the increase in value of the euro," said Ludovic Subran, chief economist at trade credit-insurer Euler Hermes. "If the dollar/euro rate should remain stable at this level, we will be at a disadvantage," admitted Licia Mattioli, vice-president for international affairs at the Italian employers' organization Confindustria.

"The effect would be crosswise on our exports, which have grown the past few years towards America. We are exporters to the United States in a number of sectors: fashion, accessories, jewels, food, automobiles, machinery...", she said.

However, Lucia Tajoli, professor of economic policy at Polytechnic in Milan, notes the euro is not "super strong" and thinks Italian exports due their growth in

recent years can take some pressure. "They could suffer a little but there shouldn't be extremely heavy impacts," she told AFP.

For France, the rise of the euro is going to be "felt strongly in some sectors such as aeronautics," said Subran, adding that big enterprises involved in major exports have shown in the past they know how to adapt to a rising euro. For the moment, the strong euro is not bothering Spain as two thirds of its exports are to EU countries. However, growth in exports outside the bloc—which has increased by five percent during the first five months of this year compared with the same period in 2016 — could ultimately be affected.

Growth risk?

The euro's rebound comes with the economic recovery of the eurozone on track. "The eurozone is today seen by many as a zone of stability," Philippe Waechter, an economist at Natixis, told AFP. The economy in the 19-country single currency area grew by 0.6 percent in the second quarter, compared with 0.5 percent in the first three months of the year, the Eurostat statistics agency said this week. Compared with the same quarter in 2016, economic output in the eurozone rose by 2.1 percent, it added.

"All in all, the eurozone economy has rounded out the first half of the year in a very healthy state and seems to be set up nicely for continued firm growth for the rest of 2017," said analyst Bert Colijn of ING. Eurozone growth as a whole rose twice as fast as in Britain, where gross domestic product was up 0.3 percent in the last quarter.

Then on Thursday the Bank of England cut its UK growth forecasts with governor Mark Carney warning that high inflation triggered by a Brexit-fuelled slump in the pound had hurt consumer spending. So for now the strong euro is expected to have little impact on overall eurozone growth, said Subran, who estimated a loss of 0.1 percentage point this year. However if the single currency continues to strengthen the impact on growth could reach between 0.3-0.4 percent next year. —AFP

GREEK GDP STATS GAPS PROMPT SUSPENSION OF FLASH DATA

ATHENS: Greece's statistics service ELSTAT has suspended until further notice the release of flash quarterly estimates on the country's gross domestic product because of divergences with provisional estimates, an official at the statistics service said yesterday.

The move means that flash data will not be issued on Aug. 14. Nationwide quarterly GDP data will be released on Sept. 1, taking into account more information than the early indicator of the flash estimate. That quarterly figure, known as provisional data, can also be

subject to revisions over time. The quality of Greek statistical data is under constant scrutiny by Brussels since the country plunged into crisis in 2010, requiring to date three international bailouts to stave off bankruptcy.

Discrepancies in the way the budget deficit was calculated before 2010 - which angry eurozone partners say concealed the extent of the deficit - helped trigger the financial crisis that engulfed Greece and the eurozone. A senior ELSTAT official told Reuters the suspension of the flash data was necessary because flash data

was issued on the basis of incomplete information, which subsequently needed revisions when more data came in.

"We will probably not publish flash estimates for the next coming quarters after recent divergences," the ELSTAT official said. There have been considerable differences in the past two quarters between flash data, issued 45 days after the lapse of the reference period, and provisional data that follows and is released within a 60 day period.

On June 2, ELSTAT upwardly revised its first-quarter GDP estimate to an expan-

sion of 0.4 percent quarter-on-quarter on a provisional basis; flash data released 15 days earlier had estimated the economy had contracted by 0.1 percent.

Similarly in March, ELSTAT said Greece's economy shrank 1.2 percent in the last quarter of 2016, a considerable revision from a 0.4 percent crimp it gave a fortnight earlier.

"We don't have all the necessary data for the flash estimates on time. We just have data only for two months of the quarter on employment and not the final data for the current account bal-

ance," the official said. "We want to explore the availability of the necessary data sources and improve the consistency of the flash estimates."

Many statistics services in the eurozone announce their flash estimates on GDP 45 days after the end of the previous quarter and provisional estimates 60 days later.

Ireland, Luxembourg and Sweden do not issue flash data. The release of flash estimates is not mandatory under European legislation. The official said that Eurostat has been informed on the matter.—Reuters

CHINA JULY FX RESERVES HIT 9-MTH HIGH ON WEAK DOLLAR

BEIJING: China's foreign exchange reserves rose twice as much as expected in July to a nine-month high as tighter regulations and a weaker dollar keep capital outflows in check.

A dramatic reduction in capital outflows - which are seen as one of China's biggest risks - has helped boost confidence in its economy this year as policy-makers preach stability ahead of a key political leadership reshuffle in coming months. China's forex reserves, the world's largest, rose \$24 billion in July to \$3.081 trillion, compared with an increase of \$3.2 billion in June, central bank data showed yesterday. It was the first time that China's reserves had climbed for six months in a row since June 2014, and lifted them to the highest level since last October.

The country's foreign exchange regulator said weakness in the dollar helped push up the value of non-dollar currencies in its holdings. The euro, in particular, gained more than 3 percent against the greenback last month.

Excluding those valuation effects, China's reserves would have fallen by \$5.2 billion in July, China Merchants Securities economists estimated in a research note following the data.

China burned through nearly \$320 billion of reserves last year, but the yuan still fell about 6.5 percent against the surging dollar, its biggest annual drop since 1994. ING economist Iris Pang estimated outflows eased to about \$10 billion in July. Such a modest level should reduce any pressures on the yuan for the rest of the year, she said, while adding she does not expect authorities to relax restrictions on capital outflows anytime soon.

China's forex pile fell below the closely watched \$3 trillion level in January for the first time in nearly six years, raising market fears that Beijing may devalue its currency to relieve the pressure.

But the yuan has rebounded more than 3 percent so far this year, thanks largely to a reversal in the dollar, tougher policing of outflows and fresh steps by the central bank to flush out speculators who were betting the currency would continue to fall. The yuan strengthened around 0.8 percent against the dollar in July, its third straight month of gains.

The strong rebound "has changed market expectations to yuan appreciation (from depreciation)," said ING's Pang. In the first half of the year, Chinese com-

mercial banks sold a net \$93.8 billion of foreign exchange, down 46 percent from the same period last year.

"The balance in the foreign exchange market in the first half of the year was the best in three years," the State Administration of Foreign Exchange (SAFE) said last month, adding that it expected cross-border flows to remain stable due to the country's strong economic performance and more benign conditions globally.

Fresh measures

In addition to clamping down on outflows since late last year via administrative measures, Beijing has more recently taken aim at some overseas investments by Chinese firms as it looks to keep the yuan on a more even keel. China's non-financial outbound direct investment (ODI) fell by nearly half in the first half of 2017 as the tighter capital restrictions began to bite.

Reuters reported in July that China's regulators have told banks to stop providing funding for several of Dalian Wanda Group's overseas acquisitions as Beijing looks to curb the conglomerate's offshore buying spree. Authorities will "severely crack down on underground banks and other foreign exchange violations to prevent and resolve risks from cross-border capital flows", the forex regulator said in an internal meeting last month.

The SAFE reiterated that it will back legitimate overseas investments by domestic firms and will continue to monitor overseas investments in property, hotel, entertainment, sports and movie industries. Combined, the more stringent regulatory measures, a weaker dollar and pressure on acquisition hungry domestic firms have helped pull the yuan away from the 7 to the dollar mark which is believed to be closely watched by China's top policymakers.

Still, in 12 months' time the yuan is expected to have erased most of the gains made this year, providing the US Federal Reserve sticks to a gradual policy tightening path, boosting the dollar, a Reuters poll showed last week. From current levels around 6.72, the yuan is forecast to weaken to 6.85 in six months and 6.90 in a year, according to the poll of over 60 foreign exchange analysts taken July 27-Aug 2. The value of China's gold reserves rose to \$75.084 billion at end-July, from \$73.585 billion at end-June. — Reuters

GERMAN INDUSTRIAL OUTPUT DROPS UNEXPECTEDLY IN JUNE

FRANKFURT AM MAIN: German industrial production declined in June, disappointing analysts' expectations, official data showed yesterday.

Production fell by 1.1 percent month-on-month in June, after a 1.2-percent rise in May, according to figures adjusted for price, seasonal and calendar effects from federal statistics authority Destatis.

The June figure fell short of the 0.25 percent growth predicted by analysts surveyed by Factset.

Industrial production is closely watched as an indicator of the health of an economy, and has been on the rise in Germany in recent months along with indicators of business, investor and consumer confidence. Looking at the different industrial

sectors, capital goods makers' output fell 1.9 percent, while producer goods production was down 1.2 percent and consumer goods production declined by 0.7 percent. Construction output fell 1.0 percent, while the energy sector was the only ones to report increased production, 1.4 percent higher than in May.

Despite the fall in June, "the business situation in industry continued to revive in the second quarter," the economy ministry in Berlin said in a statement, noting that production only sank in June after five consecutive months of increases.

"Industrial orders and indicators for the business climate suggest that the upward trend in industrial production will continue," the ministry added. —AFP

Additionally, the report maintained its neutral view on Commodities, indicating that investors are more likely to benefit from tilting their investments towards oil and shying away from gold, as it continues to be susceptible to further US interest rate hikes. The latest instalment of the report has also maintained its neutral allocation to both Real Estate and Alternative Trading Strategies.

DIP IN CONSUMPTION, COMMODITY PRICES HIT INDONESIA Q2 GROWTH

JAKARTA: Indonesia's economy grew a slower-than-expected 5.01 percent in the second quarter as a dip in household consumption and a slowdown in key commodity prices hit the resource-rich country, data released yesterday showed. The year-on-year expansion was unchanged from the first quarter but below the government target of 5.2 percent growth for 2017.

"We have to admit that the 5.01 percent growth is below our expectation, but I'd say it's still quite good considering the global economic conditions and the decreasing commodity prices," Suhariyanto, the head of Indonesia's Central Statistics Bureau, said. President Joko Widodo came to power in 2014 on a pledge to boost economic expansion to seven percent but his government has struggled to lift growth rates in Southeast Asia's largest economy, which is rich in resources but has suffered from a slump in commodity prices.

Household consumption, which accounts for more than half of Indonesian GDP, was the main driver of growth, expanding 4.95 percent year-on-year but down from the 5.07 percent growth seen in the second quarter last year. Growth in trade dipped, due to a slowdown in domestic goods production and the supply of imported goods, Suhariyanto said.

Capital Economics described the result as another disappointing quarter for Indonesia. "Looking ahead, we see little prospects of a sustained recovery," Gareth Leather, senior Asia economist at the consultancy, said. Authorities have been scrambling to boost growth, with the central bank slashing interest rates six times last year and Widodo announcing a series of economic stimulus packages. Although Widodo's pledge of raising growth rates to seven percent a year looks unlikely, Indonesia's economic fundamentals have improved in recent years.

Standard and Poor's (S&P) upgraded Indonesia's sovereign bond rating to investment grade in May, bringing it in line with the two other major agencies, Moody's Investors Service and Fitch Ratings. The World Bank said in June Indonesia needed to press ahead with structural reforms to lessen its commodity dependence. Improving the tax-GDP ratio and reforming sectors protected from foreign investment should be priorities, the global lender said. — AFP

MINISTER: GERMANY SHOULD CONSIDER ELECTRIC CARS QUOTAS

BERLIN: Germany should consider introducing binding quotas for electric cars for an automobile sector seeking to recover from a diesel emissions scandal and keep its place as a leading producer, deputy economy minister Matthias Machnig said yesterday.

The comments set up a possible policy clash with German carmakers, whose lobby group says it opposes such quotas. Britain said last month it would ban the sale of new petrol and diesel cars from 2040 in an attempt to reduce air pollution. The global auto industry debate could one day herald the end of more than a century of reliance on the combustion engine.

"We want Germany to remain the top car country in the future," Machnig told Reuters, adding that issues like digitalization and new technologies in motors would decide who stays at the top of the game. "That's why we should talk about a binding target to really get electromobility going in Europe and also in Germany," said Machnig, a member of the Social Democrats, junior coalition partners of Chancellor Angela Merkel's conservatives.

He added that the whole automobile industry faced a major upheaval that it would cope with using innovation. Machnig was reacting to a report in German newspaper Handelsblatt that cited European Union sources as saying the European Commission wanted

to accelerate the retreat from combustion engines by setting a quota for low emission cars such as electric cars from 2025.

But the European Union said yesterday it had no plans to introduce quotas for electric cars for an automobile sector seeking to recover from the Volkswagen diesel scandal.

"Generally speaking, the Commission is looking into ways to promote use of low carbon energy and transport but none of them includes quotas for electric cars," a spokeswoman for the EU executive said. "We do not discriminate between different technologies," she added.

The Handelsblatt report said the sources believed a minimum sales level alongside stricter limits for CO2 emissions were already part of measures to promote climate-friendly mobility that the Commission wants to present by the end of the year.

VDA auto industry lobby was quoted as saying: "We think such sales quotas are, in principle, the wrong choice." A spokesman for the German transport ministry said on Monday he was not aware of any suggestions about introducing a quota for electric cars or other low emission cars in the medium term.

Speaking at a government news conference, he said the transport ministry wanted Germany to remain a top car producer but wanted to be open regarding the technology to enable that. — Reuters

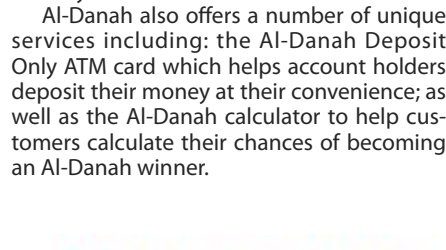

EUROZONE ECONOMIC GROWTH ACCELERATING

On a quarterly basis the eurozone economy is growing albeit on a small scale. This is quite encouraging at a time of concern about UK leaving the European union, Donald Trump's discouraging talks about unfair trades by the US partners and threat of sanctions on Russia, China and Venezuela. On top of these the Euro has risen sharply against the US dollar and other major currencies.

The quarterly economic growth has expanded by a small amount of only 0.6 percent but this is higher than the previous quarterly growth of 0.5 percent. The economic growth is spreading throughout the 19 nations that represent the block. This is a sign of the block's upswing that is becoming increasingly robust and self-sustaining. All the economic numbers, business statistics, unemployment and manufacturing output are signaling that the block's economy is gaining steam and growing. This is encouraging for the European Central bank that has been supporting economic growth with its accommodative monetary policy and its refusal to reverse its quantitative policy.

The European Central banks is forecasting and expecting solid and broad based economic recovery in the months ahead. Based on the latest economic numbers, an acceleration in economic growth is something likely to happen. As long as inflation is underpinned by low wages and lower energy prices, the European Central bank is quite happy to continue with its easy monetary policy.

For the first time in a while, the French economy enjoyed its strongest continuous expansion in the second quarter, driven by exports and investment, while Spain experienced the fastest growth since 2015. Some other economies also gathered momentum. Although unemployment in Germany continued to decline the economy has surprisingly slowed down as its export led economy has been impacted by the strength of the euro mostly against the US\$.

As for the eurozone corporate results that reflect the weakness or the strength of the economy, it has been surprisingly strong and quite encouraging. The strength of the corporate result has spread to most sectors. Led by luxury good items, food, staffing recruitment and chemicals, all have reported good results during the second quarter. The only sector that has been discouraging is the auto industry. That is something might worry the official in Germany. The German car industry employs about 20 percent of the entire German workforce. The European Central bank president Mr. Mario Draghi has expressed confidence that the solid, broad-based recovery will extend into the second half, with a healing labor market and a closing output gap fueling a sustained inflation pickup.

Positive sentiment among industries and investors hit a decade-high in July, with most industries saying they're working at a higher capacity and selling-price expectations increasing in all sectors. Inflation has been the sticking point in this economic recovery. Any price pressure or input prices have not been passed to consumers yet. This for the time being is good news for consumers. The inflation rate stayed at 1.3 percent in July, below the ECB's goal of below, but close to, 2 percent.

The hint of economic convergence among all industries should be encouraging to equity investors. The higher corporate earnings should make forward equity valuation quite attractive relative to some other region in particular the US stock market. Added to this the muted reaction by the European Central bank to any changes to its monetary policy makes European equities quite appealing to international investors. @Rasameel.

GHANA CONSIDERS LAW TO LIMIT FISCAL DEFICIT TO 5%

ACCRA: Ghana is considering passing a law that will restrict government's fiscal deficit to not more than 5 percent of GDP, the country's Senior Minister Yaw Osafo-Mafo said yesterday.

The proposed Fiscal Responsibility law will have provisions to punish government officials who exceed spending limits, Osafo-Mafo told a meeting of business leaders in the capital Accra. Ghana, which exports cocoa, gold and oil, is following a three-year program with the IMF to restore fiscal balance to an economy dogged by a high fiscal deficit and large public debt, after a period exuberance during the oil boom

years. "We are proposing a Fiscal Responsibility Law that will restrict government spending within a band of 3-5 percent fiscal deficit anything above five percent should be considered as an infringement," Osafo-Mafo said. The government of President Nana Akufo-Addo, which assumed office in January, plans to lower fiscal deficit to 6.3 percent in 2017, from 9.3 percent in 2016.

"The essence of the law is to get the economy back on track and make it impossible for any government to reverse the motion ... so people who break the limit would be made to suffer for it," he added. — Reuters

NO MORE RANSOM CELEBRATES 1ST INCREDIBLE YEAR

DUBAI: About one year ago the No More Ransom initiative was launched by the Dutch National Police, Europol, McAfee and Kaspersky Lab. Today there are more than 100 partners, as major ransomware attacks continue to dominate the news, hitting businesses, governments and individuals all over the world.

No better cure than prevention

Ransomware has soared since 2012, with criminals lured by the promise of profit and ease of implementation. Every quarter there are more new ransomware families, more variants of existing families, and more attacks. The threat continues to evolve, becoming stealthier and more destructive, and targeting businesses more than individuals because the

potential returns are much higher. The indiscriminate WannaCry attack in mid-May claimed more than 300,000 business victims across 150 countries in its first few days, crippling critical infrastructure and businesses. Some organizations are still struggling to recover from ExPetr attacks of 27 June. The total number of users who encountered ransomware between April 2016 and March 2017 rose by 11.4 percent compared to the previous 12 months, from 2,315,931 to 2,581,026 users around the world.

First year in numbers

The site now carries 54 decryption tools, provided by 9 partners and covering 104 kinds (families) of ransomware. These tools have been downloaded

225,000 times and have managed to decrypt more than 28,000 devices. The portal has had more than 24.5 million page views since its launch, with a consolidated average of 0.4 million per day. On 14 May alone, during the WannaCry crisis, 150,000 people visited the website.

The No More Ransom platform is now available in 26 languages, with the most recent additions Bulgarian, Chinese, Czech, Greek, Hungarian, Indonesian, Malay, Norwegian, Romanian, Swedish, Tamil and Thai.

More than 100 partners

No More Ransom now has over 104 partners, including Associated, Supporting and Founding

members. The most recent joins include, from the private sector: Bitsight, Fortinet, Claranet, CERT.BE, vpnMentor, KISA (Korean Internet & Security Agency), Global Forum on Cyber Expertise (GFCE), Bournemouth University (BU), EST Security, TWCERT/CC, Abelssoft, Ascora GmbH, InterWorks, LLC and CSA Singapore.

Three new law enforcement agencies have joined from Czech Republic, Greece, and Iran. IS THERE FINALLY SOME RELIEF FROM ANNOYING ROBOCALLS?

SCAMMERS REACH PEOPLE USING AUTODIALERS

NEW YORK: For Michael Rizzo, answering the phone is too often a waste of time. His Sports City Pizza Pub in Buffalo, New York, depends on customers calling to order wings, pizza and potato skins. But much of the time, it's an automated message pushing a scam. "It's getting to the point where it's blocking other callers from coming in," the 24-year-old bar owner said. Help is coming, if slowly. Over the past year, prodded by the government, cellphones have added new tools to counteract unwanted "robocalls." The Federal Communications Commission has proposed letting phone companies block more spam and is hoping to deter scammers with big fines. Experts say these steps are not a cure-all, but they're a good start.

nology that makes a phone's caller ID display a local or important-looking caller, like the IRS. Cracking down on "spoofed" numbers would make running a scam more difficult and save US consumers millions of dollars, a group of state attorneys general said in an FCC filing.

What phone companies are doing?

Phone companies and independent apps can screen or block unwanted calls by checking them against databases of known problem numbers and analyzing suspicious behavior, like a number that's calling lots of people on Do Not Call lists. Wireless carriers also have tools that flag incoming calls with warnings like "scam likely," but they aren't available on all phones, or to

through all home phone providers and won't work with older, copper-based landlines. You can also buy gadgets , some pretty clunky, that block calls on home phones. Verizon is also testing warnings about suspicious calls on a home phone's caller ID display.

Help from the government

Phone companies can already block some calls that are being faked. The FCC has proposed rules to formalize that practice and permit them to block other calls they suspect are scams. That means Verizon can block a toll-free number that accepts calls for a bank but never initiates a call. Carriers would also be able to block calls they know aren't legitimate, like a number with a 911 area code. The rules still need to be finalized.

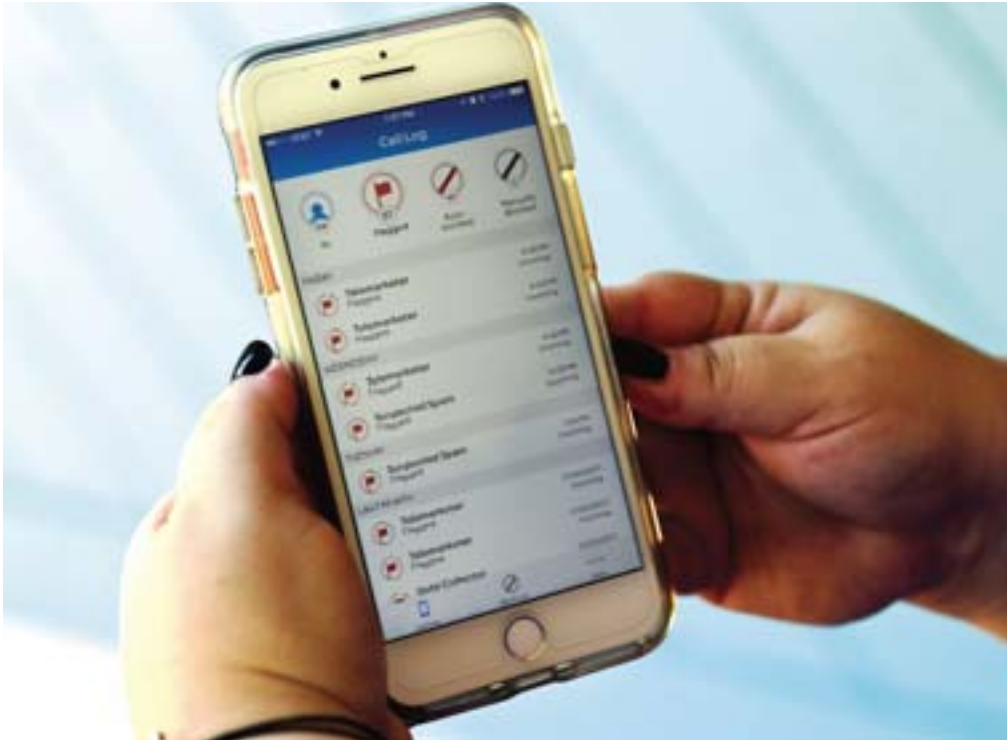
Maureen Mahoney, a public policy fellow at the nonprofit Consumers Union, said the development is "promising," but won't protect consumers from all unwanted calls. For one thing, "Do Not Call" lists don't apply to certain types of callers, such as debt collectors and political campaigns. In addition, Mahoney said, the FCC rules would cover only faked numbers. Not all robocalls are spoofed. Consumers Union wants phone companies to make call-blocking tools available to all consumers for free. In the longer term, the FCC supports industry efforts to verify that callers are really who they say they are.

Perhaps one day, you'll see a green checkmark on your smartphone when the caller is legitimate. US Telecom, the phone-company lobby, says rolling this out could take a few years, but would prove powerful against robocallers. The FCC is also seeking ways to stop annoying calls from dogging consumers when they change numbers. Today, if you sign up for Do Not Call but then get a new number, a marketer may not know and could pester you on your new line.

What can you do?

Robocallers aren't going away, said Aaron Foss of Nomorobo, a call-blocking service for cellphones and home phones. "These guys are criminals and they're going to find their way around any system. But it's our job to make sure we make it as difficult for them as possible." There are common-sense measures for consumers to follow. Don't answer the phone if you don't recognize the number. (Yes, this is impractical on business phone lines, like Sports City's.)

Hang up on unwanted callers. Don't talk to them or press any buttons. If you engage with them, they might flag you as someone who's responsive and inundate you with more calls. Block the number after the call, if possible. Use call-blocking apps. If you have privacy concerns, check the app's policy to see if it's sharing your call or contacts data with marketers. Don't give callers personal information, like bank account or Social Security numbers.—AP

Why is this happening?

The federal and state "Do Not Call" lists are supposed to protect people from unwanted calls from telemarketers. But scammers don't care about breaking the law. Scammers reach people cheaply and easily using "autodialers," which spew out a large number of calls automatically. It's estimated that Americans receive tens of millions of robocalls every day. Not all of them are fraudsters, of course. Pharmacies send automated messages about prescriptions being filled.

But too often, it's this: you owe the IRS money; it's Microsoft calling to fix your computer; free cruises! And spam callers have tricky tech-

nology that makes a phone's caller ID display a local or important-looking caller, like the IRS. Cracking down on "spoofed" numbers would make running a scam more difficult and save US consumers millions of dollars, a group of state attorneys general said in an FCC filing.

Many prepaid customers. The versions from Verizon and Sprint cost extra. A few Android phones, including Google's Pixel, screen spam calls for free. Jen Vargas, 39, a multimedia producer from Orlando, Florida, said her AT&T app flags and blocks some fraudulent calls to her cellphone, but she's given up with the landline.

"Very rarely do I pick up a call from a number I don't know," Vargas said. Apps including YouMail and Nomorobo offer relief on home phones for free, with limitations. With YouMail, your carrier must allow "conditional call forwarding," which forwards calls if a line is unanswered or busy. Nomorobo isn't available

NEVER TOO OLD TO CODE: MEET JAPAN'S 82-YEAR-OLD APP-MAKER

FUJISAWA, Japan: When 82-year-old Masako Wakamiya first began working she still used an abacus for maths—today she is one of the world's oldest iPhone app developers, a trailblazer in making smartphones accessible for the elderly. Frustrated by the lack of interest from the tech industry in engaging older people, she taught herself to code and set about doing it herself. The over 60s, she insists, need to actively search out new skills to stay nimble.

"As you age, you lose many things: your husband, your job, your hair, your eyesight. The minuses are quite numerous. But when you learn something new, whether it be programming or the piano, it is a plus, it's motivating," she says. "Once you've achieved your professional life, you should return to school. In the era of the internet, if you stop learning, it has consequences for your daily life," Wakamiya explains during an AFP interview at her home near Tokyo.

She became interested in computers in the 1990s when she retired from her job as a bank clerk. It took her months to set up her first system, beginning with BBS messaging, a precursor to the internet, before building her skills on a Microsoft PC, and then Apple's Mac and iPhones. She asked software developers to come up with more for the elderly, but a repeated lack of response led her to take matters into her own hands. Wakamiya learned the basics of coding and developed 'Hinanadan' one of Japan's first dedicated app

games for the over-60s—she is now in such demand that this year Apple invited her to participate at their prestigious Worldwide Developers Conference, where she was the oldest app creator to take part.

Source of inspiration

'Hinanadan'—the doll staircase—was inspired by the Hina Matsuri, a doll festival which takes place every March, where ornamental dolls representing the emperor, his family and their guests are displayed in a specific arrangement. In Wakamiya's app, users have to put them in the correct positions—a task which is harder than it sounds, requiring memorization of the complex arrangements. The app, which is currently only available in Japanese, has been downloaded 42,000 times with hundreds of positive comments from users.

And while these figures are relatively small compared to Japan's big-hitting apps which are downloaded in their millions, 'Hinanadan' has proved popular enough that Wakamiya plans to release English, Chinese and possibly French versions of the app before next year's festival. Its success has propelled her on to the tech world stage, despite the industry's reputation for being notoriously ageist. In Silicon Valley, workers in their 40s are considered old by some firms and according to media reports citing research firm Payscale, the median age for an employee at Facebook is 29 and at Apple is 31.

But international tech firms and

start-ups are slowly waking up to the economic potential of providing for silver surfers, and Wakamiya has already met with Apple's chief executive Tim Cook. Wakamiya recalls: "He asked me what I had done to make sure that older people could use the app. I explained that I'd thought about this in my programming—recognizing that older people lose their hearing and eyesight, and their fingers might not work so well." "Mr Cook complimented me," she says proudly, adding that he had hailed her as a "source of inspiration".

No time for sickness

Wakamiya concedes that she finds "writing lines of code is difficult" but has a voracious appetite to learn more. "I want to really understand the fundamentals of programming, because at the moment I only learned the elements necessary for creating 'Hinanadan'," she explains. More than a

quarter of Japan's population is aged 65 and above, and this is projected to rise to 40 percent by 2055. The government is struggling to ensure its population remains active and healthy—and so also see the dynamic octogenarian as an inspiration.

"I would like to see all Japanese elderly people have the same motivation," one official said. Wakamiya says her ultimate goal is to come up with "other apps that can entertain older people and help transmit to young people the culture and traditions we old people possess". "Most old people have abandoned the idea of learning, but the fact that some are starting (again) is not only good for them but for the country's economy," said Wakamiya, who took up the piano at 75. Hinting that her good health is down to an active mind and busy life, she adds: "I am so busy every day that I have no time to look for diseases."—AFP

SOFTBANK ADDING TECHNOLOGY AMBITIONS, WITH ARM, ROBOTICS

TOKYO: Photo ops of SoftBank Chief Executive Masayoshi Son sometimes show him chatting happily with his company's humanoid robot, the childlike Pepper, or grinning as President Donald Trump heaps praise on him for creating American jobs. It's clear Son, Japan's richest person, stands out in Japan Inc. He is no "salaryman" president, those typical executives who rise gradually and quietly through the ranks, Japan-style, in a corporate culture that frowns upon mavericks and tends to squelch self-made ventures.

Since founding SoftBank in 1981, Son, a Japanese of Korean ancestry who graduated from the University of California, Berkeley, has won both criticism and accolades as a daring investor who has gathered partners in diverse technology sectors from around the world. Sometimes those adventures cost him. But often, they have paid off. SoftBank Group Corp. reported Monday a 98 percent drop in its April-June profit at 5.5 billion yen (\$50 million) on losses stemming from investments in the Chinese e-commerce company Alibaba.

Quarterly sales rose 3 percent to 2.19 trillion yen (\$20 billion), while the Tokyo-based company's operating profit, which highlights core operations, logged a 50 percent increase year-on-year as its US mobile carrier Sprint, previously a drain on the bottom line, boosted profitability. The first telecoms carrier to offer the iPhone in Japan, SoftBank has bought British semiconductor company ARM. Its acquisition of US robotics pioneer Boston Dynamics is awaiting regulatory approval.

Recently, it has announced it will invest in Encored, a US company specializing in IoT technology in the energy sector. Son believes artificial intelligence combined with data gathered by billions of sensors will benefit people more than the 19th Century Industrial Revolution, helping to treat cancer, deliver accident-free driving and grow safer food. Son also has money to invest: a private fund he set up last year for global investments in the technology sector, called the Vision Fund, with the potential to grow to as much as \$100 billion.

Information revolution

Trump has praised him for promising to invest \$50 billion in US startups to create 50,000 jobs. Son stressed at a news conference Monday that his company was neither an old-style Japanese "zaibatsu," a business conglomerate with roots dating to the 19th century Meiji Era, nor a venture capital outfit pursuing a quick payback. SoftBank tries to influence strategy in the businesses it invests in, without exerting outright control or overhauling their management, he said,

instead collaborating on a shared vision of what he called the "information revolution."

"We don't try to stamp our color on our group companies," he said. "We feel a brand should be free." Son's spectacular rags-to-riches story, making one big acquisition after another including an approximately 40 percent stake in Yahoo in the 1990s, has left many skeptical over what appears to be a risky way to run a business, said Satoru Kikuchi, a senior analyst at SMBC Nikko Securities Co. But as he added stakes in one technology powerhouse after the other, names like Microsoft Corp., Novell, Cisco Systems, Ziff-Davis and Comdex, Son has shifted gears when necessary, adjusting his portfolio and often emerging a winner and winning trust from key investors, Kikuchi said.

"His goal is to become the No. 1 company in the world through expanding in the technology area," he said. "He has the ability to gather money and information. He can act, and he can make decisions." In a recent, nearly three-hour presentation in Tokyo, Son presented some of the ventures he is partnering with, including OneWeb, whose founder and chairman Greg Wyler wants to use satellites instead of underground cables to provide affordable internet access for everyone. He showed off Spot, a four-legged robot that can climb steps and dance.

ARM's chips are found in nearly all smartphones and wearables, he noted. Data gathered from such omnipresent sensors provide far more comprehensive data than what can be gathered through mobile phones or computers, Son said. "Those who rule chips will rule the entire world. Those who rule data will rule the entire world." Son said. "That's what people of the future will say." SoftBank also runs a solar power business, which Son plunged into with fervor after the 2011 Fukushima nuclear disaster in northeastern Japan. His business empire also includes financial-technology, ride-booking services and a baseball team, the Softbank Hawks.

Takenobu Miki, who worked closely with Son in the late 1990s and early 2000s, says Son excels in bringing together partners whom he thinks will be instrumental in the future. Big Japanese companies often hoard resources like money, facilities and employees. Son doesn't, says Miki, who now has his own business, Japan Flagship Project Co., which provides consulting and project management, among other services. He says those who criticize Son for chasing quick bucks misjudge him. "What you don't want is an unprofitable company," said Miki. "And he has a passion, a dream."—AP

CHINA'S WEB USERS FEAR LOSING TOOLS TO BYPASS 'GREAT FIREWALL'

BEIJING: Enterprising internet users in China fear the tools they use to tunnel through the country's "Great Firewall" may soon disappear, as Beijing tightens its grip on the web. Tens of millions of people are estimated to use Virtual Private Networks (VPNs) to bypass Chinese internet restrictions—getting access to blocked websites such as Facebook and Twitter. Beijing has for years turned a blind eye to these holes in its Great Firewall, but recent events suggest the virtual tunnels may soon be bricked up.

In January China's Ministry of Industry and Information Technology (MIIT) announced it would be banning the use of unlicensed providers of the services. In the months since the rule's announcement, rumors have swirled that a crackdown was coming, but there was little clarity on what exactly the rule meant and how, or even if, it would be implemented. In the past few weeks, however, omens of significant tightening seem to be everywhere.

Several luxury hotels in Beijing have said they will stop using the tools, which once provided unfiltered Internet as a conven-

ience to their customers. On Thursday, a cloud service provider in the capital notified users that it would practice shutting down and reporting VPN providers on the orders of Beijing's Public Security Bureau. Tech giants Apple and Amazon, too, have moved to limit their customers' access to the tools in China in what has been seen as a voluntary move to get ahead of the impending crackdown.

On Sunday, Apple said it was removing a number of the programs from its app store, while Amazon's Chinese partner said that customers would no longer be allowed to use "illegal" VPNs on its cloud service. "There have been many rounds of government murmurings about VPN crackdowns, and foreign and Chinese businesses had grown used to only minor or temporary restrictions," said Graham Webster, a senior researcher scholar at Yale Law School. But "this time appears different." For now, however, it still remains unclear who will be able to access VPNs and under what circumstances, a situation that has left both companies and regular users on tenterhooks. —AFP

NIGHT SWIM LEAVES AUSTRALIAN TEEN BLOODY AND BEWILDERED

SYDNEY: An Australian teenager emerged from a night-time dip in the ocean with blood streaming from his feet and ankles in a gruesome mystery that doctors have struggled to explain. Sam Kanizay waded waist-deep into the water at Brighton Beach in suburban Melbourne on Saturday evening, standing still for about 30 minutes. When he came out of the sea he was bleeding profusely from the calves down. "The cold water numbed my legs. I felt what I thought was pins and needles but maybe it wasn't just pins and needles," the 16-year-old told 3AW radio yesterday.

Washing the blood off his legs in the shower did little to stem the flow from what his family believed was an attack by

sea lice. "It sort of looked like hundreds of little pin holes or pin-sized bites distributed all over my ankle and the top of my foot," he said. Kanizay, who was rushed to hospital, said doctors could not explain what had caused the injury.

"We had a few people guessing that it was sea lice, but no one really had any ideas." His father went as far as scooping some of the tiny critters from the ocean and posting a film online of them devouring small chunks of meat.

Some reports cited experts pointing instead to stingrays or jellyfish as the suspected culprits. But Jeff Weir, from the Dolphin Research Institute, said the injury was likely caused by opportunistic

amphipods, a tiny crustacean that latches onto decaying plant or animal matter to help break it down. "They are not there to eat us, but sometimes they might take a little bit, like mosquitoes and leeches and other things out there in the environment," he said.

"He (Kanizay) must have been very, very cold and he wouldn't have felt it," added Weir, who experienced a similar injury on his forehead after a night dive 40 years ago. The veteran marine researcher said Kanizay's injury was much like a graze and he should not fear returning to the water. "I don't think there has been anything that has changed, there just aren't that many people that stand really still for that long."— AFP

DUTCH FARMERS 'POWERLESS' IN THE FACE OF CONTAMINATED EGGS

EDE, Netherlands: In the dark and silent shed of a small Dutch poultry farm, 1.8 million eggs closely packed together wait to be destroyed. In the barn, the machine that sorts and packages the eggs has been shut off and its rolling belt is starting to gather dust. In the empty courtyard, the woman of the house and a worker perform small jobs. But the fields are empty and the chickens are invisible.

Wim ten Ham's farm in the central Dutch town of Ede—where dozens of poultry farms are reputed for their eggs—is one of hundreds of farms whose eggs are suspected of having been contaminated by the insecticide fipronil.

Contamination with the toxic chemical has prompted supermarkets in Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany to remove millions of eggs from their shelves, including the discount supermarket giant Aldi which announced Friday it was pulling all Dutch eggs from stores in Germany. Authorities in Switzerland and Sweden also said they were tracking shipments and removing eggs, as the impact of the affair widened.

The Dutch food authority (NVWA) also shuttered 138 poultry farms—about a fifth of those in the country—and warned that eggs from another 59 farms contained high enough levels of fipronil that it warned they should not be eaten by children. Fipronil is commonly used in veterinary products to get rid of fleas, lice and ticks. But it is banned from being used to treat animals destined for human consumption, such as chickens. In large quantities, the insecticide is considered to be "moderately hazardous" according to the World Health Organization, and can have dangerous effects on people's kidneys, liver and thyroid glands.

'I feel powerless'

"We are closed and will remain closed until we are able to prove that fipronil has been eliminated from our chickens and is no longer present in our eggs," ten Ham said. When his farm's eggs were tested, authorities found that they contained 0.30 mg/kg of the toxic insecticide when only a level of 0.005 mg/kg is allowed. To eradicate fipronil from his farm, ten Ham has two choices: destroy all 68,000 of his chickens, which

would cost 400,000 euros (\$471,000), or induce a moult and evacuate the birds' droppings.

According to members of the Dutch poultry union, fipronil is lodged in the chickens' abdominal fat and moulting can reduce it, as the agriculture site Boerderij reported. During the moulting, which generally begins in autumn due to the decrease in light, the bird sheds feathers and loses fat. Ten Ham has since plunged his nearly 70,000 chickens into darkness and put them on a modified diet to make it easier for them to lose fat. Chickens can remain contaminated for between six to eight weeks. "I feel powerless," ten Ham said, adding that he understood rules needed to be upheld but lamented the strict regulations.

"It's trade protectionism," he said. "It's only to keep the economy going." Belgian officials admitted Saturday they knew in early June there was a potential problem over eggs contaminated with fipronil but kept it secret because of an ongoing fraud investigation. German Agriculture Minister Christian Schmidt has pressed the authorities, particularly in Belgium and The Netherlands, to clear up the situation, which he said was done with "criminal intent". It is believed the toxic substance was introduced to poultry farms by a Dutch business named Chickfriend brought in to treat red lice, a nasty parasite in chickens. Dutch and Belgian media reports that the substance containing the insecticide was supplied to Chickfriend by a Belgian firm have not been confirmed. Belgium's food safety agency (AFSCA) has said a criminal probe, in cooperation with prosecutors, had been launched.

Talk about compensation

With losses expected to run into millions of euros, it is another blow for Dutch poultry farmers after 190,000 ducks were culled in November amid a highly infectious strain of bird flu. Ten Ham has no choice but to wait until fipronil disappears and his eggs are back to containing acceptable levels of the insecticide before he can count up his losses. "Those who decide pay; they determine the rules, they decide that these eggs are not good enough," the farmer said.— AFP

AS EELS GROW IN VALUE, US CLAMPS DOWN ON POACHING

BREWER, Maine: Changes in the worldwide sushi industry have turned live baby American eels into a commodity that can fetch more than \$2,000 a pound at the dock, but the big demand and big prices have spawned a black market that wildlife officials say is jeopardizing the species.

Law enforcement authorities have launched a crackdown on unlicensed eel fishermen and illicit sales along the East Coast. Although not a well-known seafood item like the Maine lobster, wriggling baby eels, or elvers, are a fishery worth many millions of dollars.

Elvers often are sold to Asian aquaculture companies to be raised to maturity and have become a linchpin of the sushi supply chain. But licensed US fishermen complain poaching has become widespread, as prices have climbed in recent years. In response, the US Department of Justice, the US Fish and Wildlife Service and other agencies are investigating clandestine harvesting and sales. Operation Broken Glass, a reference to the eels' glassy skin, has resulted in 15 guilty pleas for illegal trafficking of about \$4 million worth of elvers.

Two people are under indictment, and more indictments are expected. In Maine, more than 400 licensed fishermen make their living fishing for elvers in rivers such as the Penobscot in Brewer and the Passagassawakeag in Belfast every spring. They say law enforcement is vital to protecting the eels and the volatile industry. Randy Bushey, of Steuben, has been fishing for elvers since 1993. He said he saw his income balloon from as little as \$5,000 per year in the 1990s to more than \$350,000 in 2012. He said tighter quotas mean he's earning less these days, and in the most recent season he made about \$57,000. "I've seen the best, and I've seen the worst," Steuben said. "I want to see it preserved. I want to see it straightened out." The elvers are legally harvested in the US only in Maine and South Carolina. The American eel fishery was typically worth \$1 million to \$3 million per year until 2011, when the economics of the industry changed. Asian and European eel stocks dried up, and the value of American eels grew to more than \$40 million in 2012 because of demand in China, South Korea and other Asian countries.

Investigators also turned their eyes to poaching in 2011, the Department of Justice told The Associated Press. The investigation of people who catch, sell or export elvers illegally has ranged from Maine to South Carolina; a New York seafood distributor was among those netted. In one case, federal prosecutors said, three men pleaded guilty in November 2016 to trafficking more than \$740,000 worth of elvers harvested illegally from the Cooper River in the Charleston, South Carolina, area. In another, Richard Austin pleaded guilty in federal court in Norfolk, Virginia, to trafficking more than \$189,000 in illegally harvested elvers from 2013 to 2015.

Eel harvesting

The federal agencies involved in the poaching investigations say there's no end date for their probe. The Department of Justice declined to speculate on how many poachers there are and how many arrests are expected. A conviction for violating the Lacey Act, which prohibits illegal wildlife trade, can carry a penalty of up to five years in prison and a fine of as much as \$250,000. Investigators go under-

cover to track poachers, posing as people illegally fishing for elvers.

They also follow eel migrations, hoping to catch illegal fishermen on the spot. Investigators also track catch records, which are required by states, to look for possible illegal

fishing and selling along the supply chain. The legwork is necessary because illegal trade in elvers jeopardizes the species' long-term sustainability, said Jeffrey H. Wood, acting assistant attorney general with the Department of Justice's environmental division.

Maine's fishery for elvers is the biggest on the East Coast, making it the sole reliable source of the eels in the US to prevent overfishing, fishermen are limited to catching them for only a few weeks every spring. The eels hatch in the ocean waters of the Sargasso Sea, a weedy patch of the Atlantic Ocean between the West Indies and the Azores. They then follow currents back to rivers and streams from Greenland to Brazil. Mature eels that avoid hazards including fishermen's nets, predatory fish and the turbines of hydroelectric plants will one day return to spawn in the Sargasso. The baby eels are tiny at the time of harvest, weighing only a few grams when they are scooped with dip-nets or trapped with larger nets that resemble small soccer goals. A well-managed eel fishery is critical to the health of the rivers and streams they swim in, said US Fish and Wildlife Service Deputy Chief of Law Enforcement Ed Grace.

Eels are important to the marine ecosystem because they serve as both predator and prey, feeding on fish and mollusks and serving as food for larger fish, seabirds and turtles.

"While the big charismatic animals like bears, big cats and eagles tend to grab all the public attention, it's often the smaller, more obscure animals that are crucial to regional ecosystems and economies," Grace said. Some eels harvested in Maine eventually return to the US as sushi dishes such as unagi. They're also used for other food products, such as grilled eel dishes popular in Asia.— AP

Kylie Minogue's club album

Kylie Minogue's new album looks set to be filled with club bangers. The Australian pop star has teamed up with a whole host of dancefloor filler makers including 'Hot Right Now' hitmaker DJ Fresh, Dutch dance duo TV Noise and songwriter Karen Poole, for her first studio album since 2014's 'Kiss Me Once'. Sharing a picture in the studio with Kylie's team, DJ Fresh - whose real name Daniel Stein - captioned the photo posted on Twitter: "Fallen Angels week with Kylie Minogue & Karen Poole! @FaithGuitars @kylieiminogue @tvnoisemusic @thecorentinlfr (sic)" The 49-year-old beauty is known for her huge dance anthems, such as 'Can't Get You Out of My Head', 'Spinning Around' and 'Sexercise', and looks set to return to that same sound she's synonymous for. It comes after DJ Sigala revealed he has worked on a track with Kylie. The 'Easy Love' producer was overwhelmed when he found out the pop superstar fell in love with his song and is considering releasing it as her comeback single. However, despite reports saying Kylie is going to go into depth about the end of her relationship with ex-

fiance Joshua Sasse - whom she parted ways with in February - the 24-year-old hunk insists the song is upbeat and more about wanting to know how the other person is feeling. Asked if he thinks she picked the track because it relates to how she was feeling after their break-up, Sigala - whose real name is Bruce Fielder - exclusively told BANG Showbiz: "Yeah maybe. Maybe without thinking about it. The song isn't a break-up song really. It is just a tell me what you are feeling kind of song. "So it has a happy vibe to the lyrics as well. I guess it can be related to a few different situations and she related it to her's." Kylie recently signed a record deal with BMG and is said to be "better than ever" since inking the deal, according to label boss Alex Cory-Smith. The blonde beauty - who parted ways with Jay Z's Roc Nation management company in 2015 following a series of professional disappointments - joined her former Parlophone boss Jamie Nelson at the label, following a frantic bidding war.



Professor Green's first gig in three years

Professor Green is set to perform his first gig in three years in aid of charity. The 'Lullaby' hitmaker will perform a one-off show for Barts Charity's Transform Trauma appeal - which raises funds for those who have suffered a traumatic injury or experience and helps get their lives back on track - at East London's intimate Village Underground on September 9, with support from rising rapper Not3s and one other act, which is yet to be confirmed. The rapper and presenter has experienced trauma personally, and has also made documentaries about mental health following his father Peter dying from suicide back in 2008. Pro Green - whose real name is Stephen Manderson - said: "I'm excited to be supporting the Transform Trauma appeal. It's been three years since my last headline gig and I can't wait to get back in front of the fans. "Trauma is something that I've had personal experience of but I didn't realize how big the issue is - people don't recognize being hit by a bus, stabbed, or caught up in a terrorist as the same thing but they all result in traumatic injury. "Every penny raised from the gig will be spent on trauma research and care, helping save the lives of the 17,000 people who die from trauma every single year." The 33-year-old London-born musician previously revealed he will continue to be vocal about mental health issues because it is something he cares passionately about. He said: "It is something is so personal to me, which is why I'm so vocal about it." Fans are invited to enter and donate £5 to be in with a chance of winning one of 320 pairs of tickets, including 5 special pairs of backstage meet and greets with the rapper himself, by entering a draw by visiting transformtrauma.org.uk.



Johnson uses nebulizer to keep voice in shape

Louisa Johnson has to use a nebulizer on tour to keep her voice in shape. The 'X Factor' winner had to explain the device she has, which consists of hot salt water, as it looked like she was using a vaping device instead of a cigarette backstage at Brighton's Pride festival - the biggest celebration for the LGBT community - over the weekend. However, it turned it out she was just keeping her voice intact. The 19-year-old beauty told the Daily Star newspaper: "I have a nebulizer that looks like a vape cigarette. "But it's actually hot water and salt water and when you breathe in it turns into steam for my voice." The 'So Good' hitmaker knows how important it is to keep her voice in check after she was put on "vocal rest" days before UK TV talent show's final, which she went on to win in 2015. And Louisa will certainly need her voice to be in tip-top condition with the amount of collaborations she'd like to do. She wants to follow in the footsteps of her pal Olly Murs and collaborate with Paul Weller. The 58-year-old rocker penned the track 'Let Me In' for the 33-year-old hunk's 2014 LP 'Never Been Better' and Louisa - who did 'Unpredictable' with Olly this year - recently revealed she is keen to setup a duet with the 'Modfather' and former Jam frontman. Speaking exclusively to BANG Showbiz, she said: "I really love Paul Weller, I didn't know that Paul Weller wrote a song for Olly Murs, I might have to give him a ring." The 'Best Behavior' hitmaker has a surprisingly eclectic taste in music and would also like to dabble in rap with dreams of teaming up with hip-hop icon Eminem. She said: "I really love Eminem, he's like my favorite artist. My love of Eminem comes from my dad, he always would be listening to his songs and albums when we'd be driving around, you just pick these things up. I have a really random love of different music from like garage to Eminem, people don't know how I like these songs."

Hayek threatened Reitman with legal action

Salma Hayek threatened filmmaker Ivan Reitman with legal action after a script was changed before she auditioned. The 50-year-old Mexican beauty went to audition for a role in a film for the 'Twins' filmmaker, but despite claiming she was originally told the lead part would be altered to suit her native language, her representatives were later told they'd be "crazy" if they thought they would accommodate her for anything other than a "bimbo" part. Speaking to the Observer Magazine, the actress said: "I've never said this to anyone, the name of the director, but it was Ivan Reitman. "I was screen-testing for the lead in a film and they said that it was not written Latin, but they wouldn't mind changing it. "I learned the script but when they sent me the pages for the audition there was none of the things I had learned, it was another role. "So my agent called them and they said, 'Are you crazy? She's Mexican. We can change the race of the bimbo, but not the lead.' "And they said 'Absolutely under no circumstances'. So I said, 'OK, you tell them that they either see, or I'm going to sue them'. "And they said 'There's no point in her coming, even if she had been the best audition she would have never gotten the part... but now we hate her. Does she want to come knowing that we detest her?' " Hayek hinted the film could have been 'Six Days, Seven Nights' - which featured Anne Heche as a style magazine journalist opposite David Schwimmer and Harrison Ford as her love interests - because she explained the argument escalated after the filmmaker was unable to believe a Mexican could be a "fashion editor". She said: "I thought that the director that could see Arnold Schwarzenegger and Danny DeVito as twin and Arnold Schwarzenegger giving birth to a child [in 'Junior'] maybe could see a Mexican as a fashion editor. "I thought I owed it to the new generation of Mexicans. That if I got this right, maybe something will shift." Despite getting off to a bad start, the actress bumped into the filmmaker years after and he apologized. Hayek said: "We had such a lovely conversation. He was so elegant. He said 'I was wrong.'"



Eminem album to arrive in autumn

Eminem's new album will reportedly be released in autumn. The 44-year-old rapper - whose last record was 2013's 'The Marshall Mathers LP 2' - is among names including Taylor Swift and Sam Smith who are expected to put out new records later this year on Universal, website HITS Daily Double reports. It comes after the hip-hop icon's manager Paul Rosenberg took over as the CEO of Universal Music Group's Def Jam Recordings label. Earlier this year, it was revealed that Dr. Dre, a longtime collaborator of the '8 Mile' star, is working on a track for the 'Lose Yourself' hitmaker's "latest album". 2 Chainz has also recorded a song for the album, but he didn't really believe the rap legend wanted to work with him when he first found out. He said: "I've heard it all, you know what I'm saying? I've heard it all. You know, this like rap talk. It's like, you see a rapper in the club and you're like, 'Let's do one!' "It's cap, you know what I mean? So you know, he's like, 'The boy wanna do something with you'. And I'm like, 'Whatever'. " The pair met up at producer Rick Rubin's house to team up on a song which was initially going to be a remix before 2 Chainz intervened. He said: "I tell him straight up ... Eminem, what would you need a remix for? Remixes are used to carry records to number one spots. When have you ever did a remix for someone or for yourself? That's cap at it's finest." 2 Chainz feels he has finally made it in the genre now that Eminem - whose real name is Marshall Mathers - has asked to record a track with him. He added: "That's how I know I can rap. He didn't want to talk about nothing but rapping. That was a great phone call to get." Eminem released his debut solo album 'Infinite' in 1996, but he really hit the headlines in 1999 when he dropped 'The Slim Shady LP', which spawned Grammy Award-winning hit 'My Name Is'.



Chan spent 45 minutes hanging from a helicopter

Jackie Chan hung from a helicopter for 45 minutes in 'Police Story 3'. The 63-year-old martial arts stuntman-turned-actor shot to fame with a number of American/Chinese movies, including 'Rush Hour' and 'Shanghai Knights', and admitted he doesn't like to repeat his stunts. Speaking to the Metro, the actor said: "I don't like to repeat myself so I try something new every time. "In 'Police Story' I jumped from the shopping mall Christmas decoration; in 'Project A' I fell down from the clock; in 'Police Story 3' I was hanging outside the helicopter for 45 minutes." For his latest movie, 'Kung Fu Yoga' the actor had a number of scenes with a real lion, who was the pet of a member of the Dubai royal family. He said: "It was lent by the Princess of Dubai - it is her pet. "In most scenes, the lion was filmed separately but we had some moments together in the car. "The lion was well trained but it was still scary." Not only was a lion loaned from the princess, but the actor said "luxury cars" were also lent by the royal family in United Arab Emirates (UAE) and streets were cordoned off. He said: "The film was shot in many countries, including China, Iceland, India and UAE. "The royal family in UAE lent us their luxury cars and the government cordoned off streets for us for car chases." Although known for his martial arts skills, for 'Kung Fu Yoga' - which has been described as a "fast-paced action comedy" by the actor - Chan attempted to do some Bollywood dancing and found it "difficult". He said: "I attempted Bollywood dancing this time! But doing stunts is what I am best at. "At first learning dancing was difficult but then the instructor related the movements to daily activities such as changing light bulbs or hitting the ground. "It became easier to remember moves."

MAXINE WATERS, THE ROCK STAR, SHINES AT BLACK WOMEN'S EVENT

Fiercely Democratic US Rep Maxine Waters was welcomed like a contemporary rock star when she entered the 2017 Black Girls Rock Awards, as the audience screamed loudly and gave her the night's rowdiest and wildest applause. Waters was one of the honorees Saturday at the annual event honoring black women in fields such as entertainment, politics, science and social justice. The 78-year-old matched the energy of the audience at the New Jersey Performing Art Center in Newark with a punchy and moving speech, which featured her catch phrase "reclaiming my time."

"I want you to know, if it was not for the love and respect shown to me by black women, those right-wing ultra conservatives ... they would have me believe I'm too black, I'm too confrontational, I'm too tough, and I'm too disrespectful of them," she said. "But now I know I'm simply a strong, black woman. "I don't care how big you are, I don't care how high

you are, if you come for me, I'm coming for you," Waters added, earning more loud applause.

Videos of the California congresswoman, who has been critical of Republican President Donald Trump, have become a viral success on social media, including one where she insisted that she was "reclaiming my time" at a recent congressional hearing. She's struck a chord with millennials and has even earned the nickname, "Auntie Maxine."

Waters was joined by a top notch group of honorees at the BET event, including iconic singer Roberta Flack; "Insecure" creator and Golden Globe nominee Issa Rae; Grammy-winning soul singer Solange Knowles; Wall Street powerhouse Suzanne Shank; "black-ish" actress and Harvard student Yara Shahidi; and community organizers Derrica Wilson and Natalie Wilson of the Black & Missing Foundation. Oscar-nominee Taraji P Henson hosted the multi-hour event. Flack, known for hit songs like "Killing Me Softly with His

Song" and "Feel Like Makin' Love," was wheelchair bound but recited a speech from paper that won over the audience.

"Love is a song. Each of you has a song in your heart," 78-year-old Flack said. "You keep singing that song." R&B singers India. Arie and Tyrese smoothly sang Flack and Donny Hathaway's popular 1970s duet, "Where Is the Love." Other performers at the show, to air on BET on Aug 22, included SZA, Ledisi, Anthony Hamilton and Tasha Cobb.

Each of the celebrants were inducted by men, including "black-ish" actor Anthony Anderson, soul singer Maxwell, "Insecure" star Jay Ellis and actor-singer Jussie Smollett. Knowles - who won her first Grammy Award this year for her critically acclaimed album celebrating black pride, "A Seat at the Table" - called the award "the ultimate honor." "Black women make me feel invincible," she said. — AP

Swift expected to testify in groping case in Denver

A few moments at a backstage photo session four years ago are about to be relived, as lawyers for pop star Taylor Swift and a former disc jockey she accuses of groping her begin picking jurors in their dueling lawsuits. Radio host David Mueller sued the singer-songwriter, saying he was falsely accused and that she should have called police instead of his bosses, who fired him soon after the June 2013 encounter. He's seeking up to \$3 million in damages.

Swift countersued, claiming sexual assault, setting up the civil trial where she is expected to testify amid tightened courthouse security. Jury selection started yesterday. Opening statements were expected to begin Tuesday in the case that could last two weeks. Court documents say it is unlikely that either side will settle. Swift is seeking a verdict that awards her

\$1, while holding Mueller responsible and "serving as an example to other women who may resist publicly reliving similar outrageous and humiliating acts," her lawsuit says.

Swift is expected to testify. Mueller is also expected to testify, along with Mueller's former boss and members of Swift's entourage. Mueller, then 51, was a morning host at a country music station when he was assigned to attend Swift's concert at the Pepsi Center in Denver. Mueller was backstage with his girlfriend when they met with Swift, then 23, in a curtained enclosure. They posed for a photo and left.

Later, Swift's bodyguard confronted Mueller with the allegation that he had reached under the singer's dress and grabbed her buttocks. Mueller denied the allegation and asked that they call the police. He and his girlfriend were

escorted out of the arena and a member of Swift's team called his boss.

Swift never went to the police. She tried to keep the situation "discreet and quiet and confidential" and was upset by Mueller's claim that "for some reason she might have some incentive to actually fabricate this story," her attorney, Douglas Baldrige, has argued in court. Mueller's attorney, Gabriel McFarland, argues that Mueller may have been misidentified after someone else touched Swift. In addition to Swift, who lives in Nashville, Tennessee, Mueller named her mother and a member of her team as defendants in the lawsuit. — AP

US hip-hop legends wrap up Newport Jazz Festival

The Newport Jazz Festival wrapped up Sunday with a closing performance from the legendary hip-hop band "The Roots" as a new artistic director put his stamp on one of the world's most venerable jazz carnivals. The three-day festival in Rhode Island, which began in 1954, has been headlined over the years by jazz greats such as Miles Davis, Duke Ellington and John

Coltrane under the stewardship of its founder-promoter George Wein.

Since Wein stepped down last year, new artistic director Christian McBride has introduced a more eclectic line-up, featuring soul, Afro-Cuban and DJs as well as more traditional jazz stars such as Branford Marsalis who appeared on Saturday night. McBride, who is himself a Grammy Award-

winning bassist, said he was proud to feature "The Roots," a band regarded as godfathers of hip-hop and best known in the United States as the house band of late-night comedian Jimmy Fallon.

"The one thing I think all these musicians have in common is that they all strive and achieve excellence," McBride told AFP. "Whatever style there is that they are in, they are

excellent at it." The festival is regarded as one of the highlights of the summer cultural calendar in the northeastern United States and is held at the same venue as the Newport folk festival. — AFP

First bar for the deaf opens in Colombia

It is not yet dark, but the two girls sitting at a table in a Bogota bar flick on the lamp on their wooden table. It is the signal to the bartender that they want a drink, in Colombia's first-ever bar for the deaf. The Sin Palabras Cafe Sordo-No Words Deaf Cafe-is the first of its kind in the country, Maria Fernanda Vanegas, one of three owners, told AFP. It is located in the trendy Chapinero neighborhood of the Colombian capital, surrounded by heavy metal and reggae joints.

"Its aim is for us, people who can hear, to adapt to the deaf, and not the other way round, which is always the case," said Vanegas. The No Words cafe has large screens playing music videos with the lyrics in sign language, and a dance floor that pulses with music to dancers who cannot hear it. The menus are also translated into sign language and there are games such as Jenga or dominos for customers to play.

Finally able to dance

Vanegas and her partners Cristian Melo and Jessica Mojica all have good hearing, but dreamed of opening a cafe for the more than 50,000 people in Bogota who do not. Colombia has

more than 455,000 deaf or hard of hearing people, according to the last census carried out in 2005. People with normal hearing also frequent the bar, which is as noisy as any other in the capital. But the difference is that here, most of the talking is done with hands. "It's the first time I can feel the music," said Erin Priscila Pinto, a first-time client enjoying a drink with her old friend Carol Aguilera.

"That makes me really happy because it's the first time I can dance," said the 23-year-old photography student. All six waiters at the bar are deaf too, and even though many of the clients do not know sign language, they manage to convey their orders with gestures or by writing them down. The bar also features small cards showing the basics of sign language for drinkers interesting in expanding their repertoire. "I feel much more at ease with waiters who are deaf. Everything is much easier," said Pinto.

Occasional 'odious' guests

There is no need to actually speak in the bar. "Communicating with people with normal hearing can be a bit tricky at first because we don't understand them," said

waiter Juan Carlos Villamil, 26. "But we get by somehow or other." Some new clients are surprised at first, but they end up getting the hang of sign language, he said. The idea for the cafe came to the owners when they saw a group of deaf people having a coffee, and asked them about their social lives. Now they want to open more bars like this across Colombia and elsewhere.

It is not all plain sailing however. Some "odious" guests occasionally take advantage of the waiters' deafness to slip out without paying or to smash glasses, said Vanegas. The bar opened on June 16, and with its exhibitions, story-telling and other cultural performances by hearing-impaired artists, it is already well on its way to becoming one of Bogota's more hip watering holes at weekends. "We want to show the world that deaf people have talent," said Vanegas, as Pinto used her smartphone to record a video to show her mother the bar where people listen with their eyes and speak with their hands. — AFP

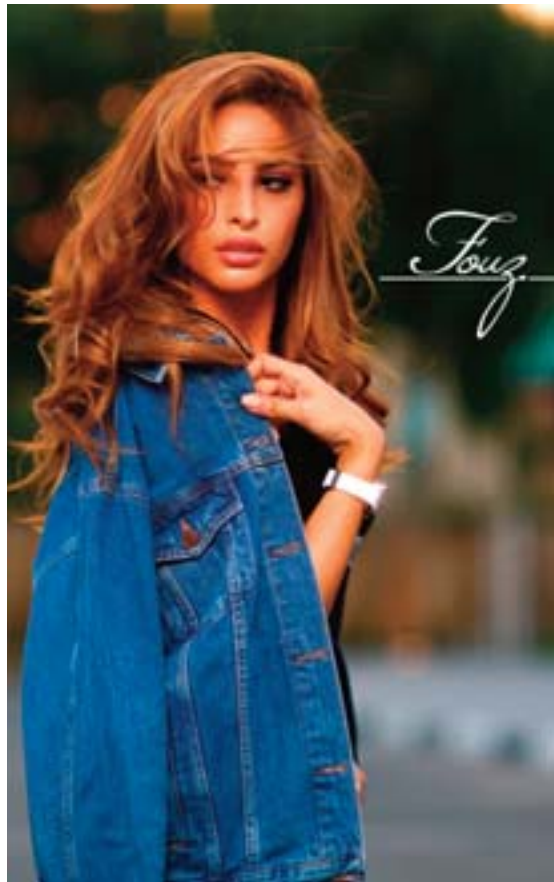
Simple tips to look stylish this summer

San Diego Opera to produce 'Frida & Diego'

A Spanish-language opera based on the tumultuous love story of famed Mexican painters Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera will premiere in 2020 in San Diego. "The Last Dream of Frida & Diego" is being co-produced by San Diego Opera and Fort Worth Opera, which will be the first to present the new supernaturally themed work in 2020. The commission is also being underwritten by the College of Fine Arts at the University of Texas at Austin and DePaul University.

After its Fort Worth debut, the opera will be presented at the Balboa Theatre as part of San Diego Opera's Detour Series of smaller-scale, nontraditional works. Production dates have not been announced. Because Kahlo and Rivera are the most important and famous Mexican artists of the 20th century, the co-producers and creative team plan to make an official announcement about the opera on Aug. 24 at the Palacio de Bellas Artes cultural center in Mexico City.

"The Last Dream of Frida & Diego" will feature a libretto (the operatic word for script and lyrics) by Pulitzer Prize-winning Cuban-American playwright Nilo Cruz and score and lyrics by Latin Grammy Award winner and pianist Gabriela Lena Frank. The opera will be set in 1957, a month before Rivera's death in Mexico City. On the Day of the Dead - when Mexicans honor family members who've passed away - the famed muralist walks through a cemetery and dreams of reuniting with his former lover, the colorful painter Kahlo, who died in 1954. For 24 hours, the underworld's keeper of souls, Catrina, releases Kahlo's spirit to wander the city with Rivera. Their tempestuous love story is told through song and their often-autobiographical paintings.

Frank will be only the second woman composer to have her work produced by San Diego Opera since its founding in 1965 (Laura Kaminsky, whose "As One" will be presented this

fall, is the first). The Berkeley-born Frank, who has been composer-in-residence for Houston Symphony for the past three years, specializes in creating works inspired by Latin American folklore. The composer-librettist team of Frank and Cruz have written nine works together over the past decade, including a song cycle about Kahlo for singer Dawn Upshaw and the St Paul Orchestra.

'Anna in the Tropics'

Frank credits Kahlo for introducing her to Cruz in Manhattan in 2007. A small opera company approached her that year about writing an opera about Kahlo, but because she didn't know how to write a libretto, a friend introduced her to Cruz. That original opera was never commissioned, but she and Cruz hit it off so well they've been collaborating ever since. Cruz is best known for his stage play "Anna in the Tropics," which won the 2003 Pulitzer. With Peruvian composer Jimmy Lopez, he adapted the 2001 novel "Bel Canto" for Lyric Opera of Chicago. He also wrote the book for Frank Wildhorn's musical "Havana."

San Diego Opera General Director David Bennett said he's thrilled to be involved in the co-production because of the company's commitment to new work and telling stories that connect with local audiences. "Creating and producing new, innovative works of opera helps us deepen connections with the diverse community of San Diego," Bennett said. "In looking for the right subject matter, the lives of Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera made perfect sense to us. Their extensive bodies of work influence creative artists here in our community, on both sides of the border." — www.sandiegouniontribune.com

Syria's traditional oud-making on the decline

'It's a profession under threat'

Antoun Tawil, one of Syria's last traditional lute makers, waits in vain in his Damascus workshop for orders of the oud, an instrument his country was once renowned for producing. While the conflict that has ravaged Syria over the past six years has devastated many of its historic crafts, the production of the oud, the oriental lute, has been particularly hard hit. Lute-makers have emigrated in large numbers, and the Damascene wood used to build the instruments has also become rare.

"There were around 20 workshops before the crisis, between Damascus, Aleppo and Hama... Now there are no more than six," four of them in Damascus, said Tawil. The slender 57-year-old is one of them. In his tiny nine-square-meter shop in Tekkiyeh Sulamaniyyeh, an Ottoman complex made up of a mosque and a crafts market, Tawil contemplates the ouds hung around him.

Some are richly decorated, delicately inlaid with mother-of-pearl and ivory. Named after the Arabic word meaning a piece of wood, the oud is a key instrument in Middle

Eastern music. It is related to the guitar, the Russian balalika and the Greek bouzouki, and the instrument is characterized by its short neck and large, full body that gives the instrument a pear shape.

'Profession under threat'
The first Damascene oud was produced in 1897 by Abdo Al-Nahhat, who became one of the country's most renowned lute-makers. In the early 20th century, the oud was the favored instrument among Syrians, played at marriages or during gatherings of female socialites. Khalifeh's atelier in the Adawi neighborhood is now half-artisanal, half-mecha-

Eastern music. It is related to the guitar, the Russian balalika and the Greek bouzouki, and the instrument is characterized by its short neck and large, full body that gives the instrument a pear shape.

'Beautiful as a Persian rug'
All six craftsmen that used to work in Tawil's two workshops have fled Syria. "Before the crisis, we opened at 5:00 in the morning and worked all day long because there was so much demand," he said wistfully. In a single month, Tawil used to sell a dozen ouds, many of them destined for abroad, including Europe and Canada. "Nowadays, a month goes by without selling anything." With the Syrian pound's devaluation, prices have also plummeted. "I used to sell an oud for 5,000 Syrian pounds (\$100). Today, I sell them for 35,000 (\$70)." Still, he talks passionately about the Syrian-specifically Damascene-oud, which he describes as both the most exquisite but also the most durable of Arab lutes. "Our ouds can last 70 years without needing maintenance," he said with a proud smile. "I've made pieces as beautiful as a Persian rug." The secret to its durability lies in the first steps of the craft, according to Issa Michel Awad, an expert in the oud and other stringed instruments at the Higher Institute for Music in Damascus.

nized. Ironically, he has found demand has increased for his products because of the relatively few competitors. While Tawil uses steam to individually shape the oud's ribs by hand, Khalifeh's workshop uses machines to bend 20 at a time and smooth the wood.

The neck's pegs are screwed in by hand. "Polishing the oud by hand takes between five and six hours. With the machine, it's done in 15 minutes," said Khalifeh, who exports across the Middle East, as well as to France and the United States. "We used to make 10-15 ouds a month, now we make 20," added Khalifeh, who learned the profession from his father at the age of 14.

Even with his own orders up, Khalifeh feel the industry is in terminal decline. "When I look at the state of my profession, I can say it is in the process of disappearing," he said. Tawil agreed. "It's a profession under threat," he said, lamenting that in addition to the effects of the war, "young people don't have the time to learn". Like many in the field, he learned the trade from his father and is now passing it on to his daughter. But he sees a glimmer of hope in the artisans who have emigrated, taking their expertise with them. "In Quebec, there are now Syrians who are opening their own production workshops," Tawil said. — AFP

Architects, refugees team up on tiny houses in Berlin

'It will be a house that mirrors society'

Troubled to see a long queue of asylum seekers shivering for hours on a winter's day outside Berlin's notoriously chaotic registration center, Van Bo Le-Mentzel decided to take action. "I fetched my drill and collected some wood that I found randomly in the streets and brought it to the line where people were standing there bored to death and we just started building," the architect told AFP. The end products were pint-sized playhouses that children could crawl into for shelter as well as break up the monotony of the endless wait.

It also marked the birth of the so-called Tiny House University, a project bringing together architects, designers and refugees to experiment with innovative ways to house a population in need. "We are trying to create new kinds of housing forms in society in which it's possible to live and survive without having land or money," said Le-Mentzel. The tiny house trend emerged several years ago, largely in the United States as people chose to downsize their living space out of environmental or financial concerns.

In Berlin, it has been given a twist for contemporary needs. For a start, Le-Mentzel's team which includes six refugees, is collaborating with the Bauhaus Archiv to build 20 tiny houses occupying 10 square meters (100 square feet) each. Together, the houses will form a temporary village on exhibition until March 2018. Some will serve as lodging, while others are destined to be a library, cafe, workshop or community center. Each building is fitted on wheels-which Le-Mentzel said means

they can be parked on public streets as a form of trailer. "In Berlin we have 1.5 million cars registered and they are all standing in the streets overnight, not in use. Each car is about 10 square meters," noted Le-Mentzel. "So I'm asking what would happen if we just replace these 1.5 million cars with tiny houses or with mobile playgrounds for kids or with open spaces where neighbors can cook together, eat together, find company together, where refugees can create a start-up in the streets-opening a restaurant, (giving) a haircut."

Microcosm of society

Like metropolitan cities worldwide, proper-

ty prices in Berlin have shot up as the city shed its Cold War divided past to become a tourism and party hotspot, as well as an investment magnet. Although new builds are mushrooming across the capital, refugees and low-income locals are finding themselves priced out. Le-Mentzel views his Tiny100 as a prototype for small apartments which can be let out for 100 euros (\$117) a month to low earners.

His ultimate goal is to fit out a building not only with regular-sized apartments, but also such compact homes, allowing the "rich and poor, students and entrepreneurs" to live together. "It will be a house that mirrors society," he said, adding that talks are ongoing with

"three or four investors" about making his dream come true. "But we are at the beginning of the process." Ali Fadi, a Kurdish refugee from Syria, has not thought that far to having his own tiny apartment.

The 33-year-old is simply reveling at being able to practice his trade. Fadi is an experienced carpenter, but had found himself shut out of the German job market because he lacked the paper qualifications. Measuring a piece of wood before sawing it off for the tiny house that would house a cafe, Fadi said he hopes that his work in the project would help overcome the bureaucratic barrier. "I hope I can get a job doing this," said Fadi.

Party for 13 in 6 sqm

At a warehouse area in southern Berlin, another member of the team, Noam Goldstein, is fitting insulation into one of the 20 tiny houses.

His version of the small home would feature not just the usual trappings of an apartment, but also include solar panels, a compost toilet and a hydroponics garden. The carpenter expects material cost for the house to run between 12,000 and 15,000 euros. While some components like windows have to be purchased, Goldstein said much of the wood used is recycled pallet wood.

"When you look at the financial aspect, it provides a very cheap way for people to build their own house," said Goldstein. Researcher Amelie Salameh, who was among the initial ones to try out the first of the 20 tiny houses overnight, is a convert.

Measuring just six square meters, the first tiny house built by Le-Mentzel himself for the project is a self-contained unit with a living room, kitchen, sleeping area, toilet and shower. "The way it was designed, there were mirrors, a lot of light, I never felt trapped inside," said Salameh, who lived in the house called Tiny100 for three weeks.

She even had two friends sleep over for a night, and once also hosted a visit of 13 people. "We had a few beers, it was fun," she said, adding that "you just have to think about where you're putting your stuff, and to tidy up constantly, because the place gets full quickly." — AFP
