AMIR RECEIVES CROWN PRINCE

OUAGADOUGOU: At least 18 people including two Kuwaiti clerics were gunned down in a Turkish restaurant in Burkina Faso, officials said yesterday, the latest West African attack to target a spot popular with expats. Kuwaiti media reports named the two Kuwaiti clerics as Sheikh Waleed Al-Ali and Sheikh Fahd Al-Husseini. There has been no claim of responsibility for Sunday night's attack at the Aziz Istanbul restaurant, which was often packed with foreign nationals.

Foreign Minister Alpha Barry told AFP that the "terrorist" attack in the capital Ouagadougou killed seven locals and at least eight foreigners including one Frenchman; one Canadian woman; male victims from Senegal, Niger, Lebanon and Turkey; and two Kuwaiti men. Three victims remain unidentified, he said. Separately, Canada's Foreign Minister Chrystia Freeland said two Canadians were among the victims. Turkey confirmed that one of its citizens was among the dead, while Paris prosecutors said at least one French national died.

Earlier in Ougadougou, Communications Minister Remis Dandjinou said about ten people had been injured, while security forces had killed two assailants in a counter-assault that went on until morning. It was not clear how many gunmen were involved in the attack. The security operation "has ended" but searches are continuing in buildings in the surrounding neighborhood, Dandjinou told reporters. He had said earlier that "some people were held" by the assailants and that "some were released", but gave no further details.

NURSE RECRUITMENT SCAM By Sajeev K Peter

KUWAIT: The media spotlight in Kuwait has once again turned to the issue of recruitment of nurses from India after media reports suggested the alleged complicity of some Kuwaiti officials in the multi-million dinar money-laundering scandal. Meanwhile, some MPs have raised the issue in parliament, quoting press reports pointing out the gravity of the matter.

According to the media reports, MPs stated that they would raise the issue in the upcoming session of the parliament and demand an investigation into the whole issue to find out if any Kuwait officials are involved in the scandal or had colluded with the Indian racketeer Uthup Varghese.

Varghese, the main accused in the nursing recruitment scam and the owner of Al-Zarafa Travel and Manpower Consultants, was arrested by the Indian Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) in March this year in Kochi on arrival from Dubai. As per

the case, Uthup swindled job aspirants of around KD 14.12 million (3 billion rupees) by taking exorbitant service charges.

While the norms mandate a service charge of KD 95 (Rs 19,500) for getting recruited to hospitals in Kuwait, Al-Zarafa charged nearly KD 9,000 to KD 10,000 (Rs 2 million) from each candidate. The CBI said Uthup amassed wealth running into millions of rupees and had attempted to influence others accused in the case.

It may be recalled that the India government had banned recruitment of nurses through private agencies in order to prevent high-level corruption and malpractices on April 30, 2015. The government also put nurses on the Emigration Clearance Required (ECR) category, placing their recruitment under a mandatory eMigrate system. It also appointed six agencies - NORKA Roots, ODEPEC, OMCL, UPFCL, TOM-COM and OMCAP - to carry out recruit-

ment of nurses to overseas countries. **Continued on Page 11**



FLOODS KILL 312 IN SIERRA LEONE, 175 IN SOUTH ASIA

FREETOWN/JANAKPUR, Nepal: At least 312 people were killed and more than 2,000 left homeless yesterday when heavy flooding hit Sierra Leone's capital of Freetown, leaving morgues overflowing and residents desperately searching for loved ones. An AFP journalist at the scene saw bodies being carried away and houses submerged in two areas of the city, where roads turned into churning

rivers of mud and corpses were washed up on the streets.

Red Cross spokesman Patrick Massaquoi told AFP the death toll was 312 but could rise further as his team continued to survey disaster areas in Freetown and tally the number of dead. Mohamed Sinneh, a morgue technician at Freetown's Connaught Hospital, said

LOS ANGELES TESTS **COOLING PAVEMENT** PAINT TO BEAT HEAT

LOS ANGELES: Can a splash of gray pavement paint help combat global warming? In Los Angeles, where summer temperatures regularly surpass 38 degrees Celsius, workers are coating streets in special gray treatments in a bid to do just that. The City of Angels, home to four million people, is the first major city to test the technology. Normal black asphalt absorbs 80 to 95 percent of sunlight, while the gray "cool pavement" reflects it - dramatically lowering ground temperature and reducing urban street heat, advocates of the method say.

During a demonstration of the technique, Jeff Luzar - sales director at GuardTop, which markets the product - showed how applying the paint could drop street temperatures by about 11 degrees Celsius after just one coat. Los Angeles is the first city in California to test the treatment on a public road, after initial trials on parking lots, according to Greg Spotts, assistant director of the city's Bureau of Street Services. "We're hoping to inspire other cities to experiment with different ways to reduce the heat island effect," he said.

CHARLOTTESVILLE/WASHINGTON: US President Donald Trump denounced neo-Nazis and the Ku Klux Klan as criminals and thugs yesterday, bowing to mounting political pressure after initially saying many sides were to blame after a whitenationalist rally turned deadly in Virginia. Trump had been assailed by Republicans and Democrats alike for failing to respond more forcefully to Saturday's violence in Charlottesville, in which a woman was killed when a man crashed his car into a group of counter-protesters.

Critics said the president had waited too long to address the bloodshed, and slammed him for initially saying that "many sides" were involved, rather than explicitly condemning white supremacists widely seen as sparking the melee. "Racism is evil and those who cause violence in its name are criminals and thugs, including the KKK, neo-Nazis, white supremacists and other hate groups that are repugnant to everything we hold dear as Americans," Trump said in a statement to reporters at the White House.

Trump said America showed its true character in such times, responding to hate with love and to division with unity. "We condemn in the strongest possible terms this egregious display of hatred,



bigotry and violence," he said. "It has no place in America ... No matter the color of our skin, we all live under the same laws. We all salute the same great flag. And we are all made by the same almighty God."

A 20-year-old man said to have harbored Nazi sympathies as a teenager was facing charges he plowed his car into protesters opposing the white nationalists, killing Heather Heyer and injuring 19 people. The accused, James Alex Fields, was denied bail at an initial court hearing yesterday.

Morocco researcher documents contributions of Kuwait's poets

FES: Moroccan poet Fatima Bohraka yesterday underlined the distinguished role of Kuwait's poets in enriching the literary movement in the Arab world. In remarks to KUNA during the signing event of her book titled "The Great Encyclopedia of Arab Poets", with the attendance of number of Arab poets and intellectuals, she listed 55 Kuwaiti poets in her encyclopedia out of 2,000, which reflected their pioneer role in the region. There is a remarkable number of female Kuwaiti poets also mentioned, including Sheikha Dr Suad Al-Sabah, Bohraka said. On Dr Suad, Bohraka said that she was the first female poet in the Arab world to issue a 'Diwan' - a book including a collection of poems - in 1961 and the second in the Gulf region after Saudi poet Princess Sultana Al-Sidairi in 1956. Bohraka praised the role of Sheikha Dr Suad Al-Sabah poems in spreading love and peace. The Moroccan poet spent nine years in preparing for the encyclopedia, being a bibliographic project celebrating Arab poets in the last half a century.






KUWAIT: Flamingo birds gather at a beach in the Free Trade Zone area in Kuwait during the spring season. —KUNA





WORKERS LOSING JOBS AS BUSINESSES COLLAPSE





The closures are particularly related to the fashion business, after stores of small companies closed at The Avenues a few months back. Also, over five stores of one company shut down. This company dealt with various luxury brands, and finally kept only two stores at The Avenues. It recently closed its store at Arraya Mall and its huge outlet in Salmiya. It still runs

three stores in Salhiya Complex, a few stores in using social media and providing delivery hit Thuraya and two at Gate Mall.

Many employees lost their jobs due to this crisis, and customers are very disappointed over not being able to shop in their favorite stores. They fear that the rest of the stores of this company will shut down too. Not only local stores, but international brands are also vanishing. After 2009, many global brands stopped manufacturing on a large scale, and limited their production to small collections that are only avail-

Online shopping and social media play a great role in competing with small businesses. Many people who are not obsessed with shopping and are not big fans of going to the market and the malls find it much easier to shop online, which from their point of view, saves time, effort, fuel, etc. On some sites, they can find almost everything they need cheaper than in the stores. Also, competition by businesses

the business of many shops. Vendors running home businesses through Instagram and other apps do not have to pay expensive monthly rentals and salaries, so they have a chance to offer better prices.

The most recent shops that closed were at Muneera Complex in Salmiya, which houses mostly cosmetics shops. Marcel, a saleslady at one of the last two fashion stores there, said that she expects the store where she works to shut down soon, as sales are weak, especially after three other fashion and accessories stores closed a few weeks back. "This complex turned into a place with cosmetic shops, while in the beginning it was a mall with mostly fashion stores and only one shop for cosmetics. Our sales are bad, and I think that the owner sells goods online. The complex even increased the rent although we have very poor sales," she told



OFFICER'S CARS SET ABLAZE

KUWAIT: Jahra detectives are investigating the case of two cars owned by a police officer that were torched. The officer said that on Saturday morning, one of his cars was torched, then on Thursday, a pick-up truck was set ablaze. It was discovered that flammable material was used in both cases. Farwaniya firemen dealt with a cooking gas leak and explosion in a house in Rehab. A sidewall collapsed and the kitchen's contents were scattered.

Forging signature

A citizen who has a power of attorney from his elderly father, accused a Bangladeshi called Rafiq of taking his father's ID, signing on his behalf and transferring his residency to a female citizen in Ahmadi. Investigations are underway to find out the employee who enabled Rafiq to transfer his residency while the sponsor was not available.

4 arrested for fighting



PRODUCER PRICE INDEX DROPS BY 7.5 PERCENT

KUWAIT: Producer Price Index (PPI) dropped by 7.55 percent for the second quarter of 2017 reaching 69.8 points, compared with 75.5 points for the same period last year, said Kuwait's Central Statistical Bureau (CSB) yesterday. The index of extractive industries group decreased by 8.27 percent due to a drop in oil extraction index by 8.29, the bureau added in its periodical statistics.

The index of transformative industries group went down by 7.07 percent due to a decrease by 10.63 percent in prices of oil refining group, it noted. The bureau pointed to direct impacts of oil extraction and refining groups on extractive and transformative industries groups. Comparison between the producer price index between the second quarter of 2017 and the same period of 2016 showed a rise of 12.04 percent as extractive industry jumped by 15.54 percent due to high prices of oil extraction group by 15.36 percent, it noted.

The transformative industries group went up by 8.85 percent owning to a rise by 13.98 percent in oil refining prices, it made clear. Producer Price Index plummeted by 4.33 percent in last June compared to June of 2016 as the extractive industries group fell by 6.54 percent.

The index of transformative industries group dropped as prices of oil refining group decreased by 3.14 percent, while prices of water and electricity group remained unchanged in the same period, the bureau said. — KUNA



SIKHS SEARCH FOR HOME 70 YEARS AFTER PARTITION

A DWINDLING MINORITY, PAKISTAN'S SIKHS FEEL LESS AT HOME THAN EVER BEFORE

PESHAWAR: Radesh Singh's grandfather was just 11 years old when he left his village in India's Puniab province to move to Peshawar. in the far northwest of the country on the border with Afghanistan. The year was 1901: The British ruled the Indian subcontinent, Pakistan wasn't even a glimmer in the eye of its founder, Mohammad Ali Jinnah, and Peshawar held the promise of work and adventure.

Singh's grandfather would never return to his village, not even in 1947, when the Indian subcontinent was divided into majority Hindu India and Muslim Pakistan, generating one of the largest migrations in modern history and unleashing a brutality that left few untouched as mobs of Hindus and Muslims turned on each other.

Singh's family is neither Hindu nor Muslim but Sikh, a religious minority in both countries. In the 70 years since Partition they have waged a secessionist uprising in India demanding outright independence for India's Punjab state where they dominate. They have felt increasingly less at home on either side of the border, but particularly so in recent years in overwhelmingly Muslim Pakistan as they too have become victims of local Taleban violence.

Singh said poverty kept his grandfather in Peshawar, located at the foot of the famed Khyber Pass and dominated by fiercely independent ethnic Pashtun tribesmen. "It's not easy to start over at zero when you have very little," he said. The hostility in the immediate aftermath of 1947 was brief in the northwest, said Singh. It was followed by decades of peace. The decision to stay in the new country now called Pakistan seemed like a good choice at the time. The Sikhs had lived peacefully for centuries alongside their Pashtun Muslim countrymen.

Glorious history

After all, said Singh, Sikhs had a glorious history in the northwest. For a time in the 18th century they oversaw a dynasty. Their capital was Pakistan's eastern city of Lahore. It was a Sikh ruler, Ranjit Singh, who rebuilt Peshawar's infamous Bala Hisar Fort, an imposing walled fortress that some historians say is as old as the city itself, which traces its origins back more than 2,000 years.

Today Sikhs are among Pakistan's smallest minorities. They are easily identifiable because of their tightly wound and often colorful turbans, and because they share the surname Singh. The CIA Factbook estimates that 3.6 percent of Pakistan's 180 million people are non-Muslims, including Sikhs, Christians and Hindus. Until 1984, Singh said, Pakistan's

Hindus and Sikhs lived as one in northwest Pakistan. Their children married, they even worshipped together. But then India's Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was assassinated by her

Sikh bodyguards. "They (Hindus) cut all relations with us. They said Pakistani Sikhs are like all Sikhs everywhere. No difference. They said, 'From now on, we will be separate from you," Singh recalled. Today Sikhs are battling with the Pakistan government for ownership of dozens of Sikh temples that they call gurdwaras; while it is slow going they have managed to reclaim some of the buildings. Many were abandoned in 1947 and taken over by Muslims who arrived from India. The Pakistan government, which took over the buildings after 1947,

allowed the squatters to remain. In a congested neighborhood in Peshawar's old city, Singh stepped through large steel gates that opened on to a sweeping courtyard. It no longer resembled a house of worship, but Singh said it was once a vibrant gurdwara attended by hundreds of Sikhs. Now two families call it home. Two clotheslines crowded with clothes drying in the blistering midday sun stretched from one end of the courtvard to the other. A child's plastic toy sat idle nearby. Elsewhere in Peshawar, an armed guard, his rifle slung loosely by his side, stood guard at the battle that resulted in Indira Gandhi's the city's largest Sikh temple, an ornate marble building that dates back 250 years. Inside a half dozen Sikh men sat on plastic chairs. It is a short, bureaucratic-looking man, a Muslim, who has the final say about who enters the gurdwara. He works for the government body that oversees properties vacated by people who fled to India in 1947. After phone calls made, names recorded, passports handed over and more phone calls made, the doors to the gurdwara were opened. revealing a cavernous carpeted room and ornate pillars decorated with hundreds of tiny mirrors. In a small room at the far end of the upper story, two students read the Guru Granth Sahib, Sikhism's holy book.


'Fear in our hearts'

Singh, who heads a council representing the Sikhs in Pakistan, said that since his homeland began to turn toward radical Islam, particularly in the Pashtun heartland, young Sikhs have been looking to leave. "They want to go to another country, not to India or Pakistan," he said, but every country eyes them with suspicion. Even Indians, he said, see his Pakistani passport and question his intentions, suggesting he wants to agitate for Sikh secessionism, death and a dream still held by many Sikhs on both sides of the border.

For Singh, Pakistan's slide into intolerance began in the late 1970s with the former Soviet Union's invasion of neighboring Afghanistan. Pakistan's military dictator Zia-ul Haq set the country on the course of Islamic radicalization as jihad became a rallying cry to defeat the communists in Afghanistan, he said.

Extremism worsened after the 2001 invasion of Afghanistan by a U.S.-led coalition, he said. The tribal regions were gradually overtaken by Taliban and in 2013 several Sikhs were killed, their limbs severed. The brutality of the killings and the threats sent thousands fleeing Pakistan, said Singh. He said today Pakistan's intolerant use blasphemy - a crime that carries an automatic death penalty - as a weapon against minorities and fellow Muslims alike.

'That is why we have a fear in our hearts, that this law can be used against us," he said. The mere accusation of blasphemy can incite mobs to violence. "In the last nearly 40 years we have been facing the boom, boom (mimicking the sound of explosions) in every city of Pakistan," said Singh. "In a long time we have not heard any sweet sounds in our Peshawar, but still we love our city." — AP

YEMEN CHOLERA CASES SOAR PAST HALF-MILLION: WHO

GENEVA: Cholera is believed to have affected more than 500,000 people and killed nearly 2,000 since late April, the World Health Organization said yesterday. A full 503.484 suspected cases and 1,975 deaths are attributable to the outbreak that erupted less than four months ago in the war-ravaged country, a WHO overview showed. More than a quarter of the deaths and over 41 percent of all suspected cases are chilCoordination of Humanitarian Affairs.

WHO said the speed at which the deadly waterborne disease was spreading had slowed significantly since early July, but warned that it was still affecting an estimated 5,000 people each day. The collapse of Yemen's infrastructure after more than two years of war between the Saudi-backed government and Shiite rebels who control the capital Sanaa has

WHO warned that the disease had spread rapidly due to deteriorating hygiene and sanitation conditions, with millions of people cut off from clean water across the country. "Yemen's health workers are operating in impossible conditions," WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said in a statement. "Thousands of people are sick,

enough medicines, not enough clean water," he said, also lamenting that many of the doctors and nurses needed to rein in the outbreak had not been paid for nearly a year. "They must be paid their wages so that they can continue to save lives," he said.

WHO said that it and its partners were "working around the clock" to support the national efforts to halt the outbreak, adding that more than 99 percent of people who contract cholera in Yemen can survive if they can access health services. More than 15 million people in the country have no access to basic healthcare. Tedros called on all sides in Yemen's conflict, which has killed more than 8,300 people since March 2015, to urgently seek a political solution. "The people of Yemen cannot bear it much longer - they need peace to rebuild their lives and their country," he said. — AFP

INDIA RESTORES HOSPITAL **OXYGEN AS ANGER MOUNTS**

GORAKHPUR, India: Indian health authorities yesterday delivered oxygen to a public hospital where 63 people have died of encephalitis in recent days, nearly half of them children, as it ran out of medical supplies because of unpaid bills, triggering public outrage. The deaths of the children have again exposed India's underfunded and poorly managed public healthcare despite Prime Minister Narendra Modi government's vows to revamp the system.

Hundreds of people die each year in India of encephalitis, a mosquito-borne disease common during the monsoon season, and no medical official directly linked the recent deaths to a lack of oxygen. But complaints that the hospital in the eastern city of Gorakhpur did not have enough supplies has stoked anger against the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party which governs Uttar Pradesh state.

"We now have adequate supplies of oxygen cylinders, there was a shortage last week... but I am not in a position to say whether they were the cause behind the deaths," R K Sahai, a senior medical officer in the hospital, said. Television images of par ents emerging from the hospital carrying the bodies of infants and alleging they died because there they didn't get oxygen have led to a firestorm of criticism of chief minister Yogi Adityanath, a saffron-robed Hindu hardliner who took office earlier this year.

Bipin Singh said his six-year-old daughter died on Thursday because of lack of oxygen and he had seen six other children die for the same reason. "My daughter and other children were unable to breathe. We kept telling the nurses that they should call the doctors. The doctors said they have ordered for oxygen cylinders but we never saw them being used."

Bahadur Nishad, who lost a four-year-old son suffering from encephalitis, said he was ready to pay for the oxygen cylinders himself. "They told me there was a shortage of cylinders," he said and turned his wrath on chief minister Yogi Adityanath whose electoral constituency is Gorakhpur. Other parents spoke of desperately trying to arrange basic materials such as cotton gauze, glucose injections and blood supplies as their children struggled for life in the wards.

Patients continued to stream into the hospital over the weekend. Some 450 patients suffering from encephalitis were admitted on Saturday alone, of whom 200 were children under 12, hospital records showed. Many were being treated on the floor and near toilets due to the shortage of beds. Government expenditure on public health is about one percent of GDP, among the world's lowest. In recent years, Modi's government has increased health spending and vowed to e healthcare more afford

The Uttar Pradesh government fired the head of the hospital as well as the doctor who headed the paediatrics department to head off criticism from the opposition. But Rajeev Misra, the sacked chief of the hospital, told reporters he had repeatedly written to the state administration to release funds to pay suppliers. Sahai, the medical officer at the hospital, said authorities were investigating the reasons for the shortage of oxygen cylinders. — Reuters

A THIRD OF SYRIAN REFUGEE KIDS NOT IN SCHOOL, DESPITE PLEDGES

SYRIA AID PLAGUED BY PERSISTENT FUNDING SHORTFALLS

MANSHIYEH, Jordan: Since his family fled civil war in Syria five years ago, 15-year-old Ali Al-Sbehi hasn't set foot in a school. Instead, he has put in 12-hour shifts in a supermarket, a fast food stand and now a coffee shop, enduring abuse from employers, back-breaking work and low pay because he is the sole breadwinner for his family of eight. "I have no future," said the lanky teen with narrow shoulders, offering a sober assessment of his prospects.

Ali is among more than half a million Syrian refugee children of school age - or one-third of the total - who are not in school or informal education in overburdened regional host countries Jordan, Lebanon, Turkey, Egypt and Iraq. They should all have been enrolled by now under a pledge made 18 months ago by donor countries and international organizations at a Syria aid conference in London.

Millions of dollars

At the time, donors promised hundreds of millions of dollars to meet the education target, as part of a shift from emergency aid to longerterm development to cope with the fallout from Syria's civil war, now in its seventh year. However, Syria aid has been plagued by persistent funding shortfalls, as donors face competing global crises.

A UN-led \$8 billion aid appeal for 2017 - \$3.4 billion for Syria and \$4.6 billion for the host countries - was only 25 percent funded by July, according to UN figures. "If we were fully funded ... more children would be back in school," said Juliette Touma, regional spokeswoman for UNICEF, the UN child welfare agency.

Money could alleviate both the direct and indirect causes of children not getting an education. Deepening poverty among refugees drives more boys into menial work and more girls into early marriage. Local schools are overcrowded. Parents often lack money for transportation to and from school, or fear for their children's safety. Progress has been made and many of the donors have stepped up, Touma said. The out-ofschool rate in regional host countries dropped from 45 percent to 34 percent between December 2015 and December 2016.

Britain's Department for International Development, when asked about donors missing the target set in London, pointed to the , saying that "for the first the start of the crisis there are more children in school than not in school." It added that "the scale of the challenge remains huge." In Jordan, about 126,000 of 212,000 Syrian refugee children are enrolled in school, with the government supporting the campaign by doubling the

number of schools with two shifts to 200 in the fall of 2016. Another 46,000 children participate in informal education. This includes new catchup programs at 60 centers where children who missed more than three years of school can make up for lost time. In the past, such children would not have been able to return to school.

Entry point

Summer school offers an entry point for those who registered late. "In Syria, there was war, and planes," said 11-year-old Mohammed Faisal, a first grader in summer school. "But I like being here. They take us out on breaks, they feed us vummy food, and the teachers treat us with kindness." This leaves about 40,000 Syrian refugee children in Jordan who can't or won't return to school, as well as thousands more at risk of dropping out.

Robert Jenkins, the head of UNICEF in Jordan, said his \$96 million education budget for 2017 is only half funded, and that this jeopardizes programs meant to encourage children to stay in school or re-enroll. Currently, about 52,000 children get cash grants of 20 dinars (\$28) a month to help with school transportation and other costs related to education, or to enable hove to quit their jobs. Jenkins said he had hoped to double the number of participants this year, but instead might have to phase out the program for lack of money. Jenkins said anecdotal evidence suggests child labor among Syrian refugees is on the rise, but that no statistics are available. "We

need to work on both supporting the families and supporting the school system together for this to be successful," he said. He said refugee parents face tough choices. "If you ask your typical Syrian refugee family, at the top of the list remains (the wish for) continuing education" of their children, he said.

When Ali Sbehi was 10, his family tried unsuccessfully to register him for school in Jordan. He was told at the time he would need to repeat third grade because his parents lacked documents showing he had already completed it in Syria. He refused to do so. Since then, he has forgotten most of what he learned in Syria. His father, who had worked in construction, became bedridden with back problems three years ago.

Ali is now responsible for supporting the family. "I cannot let my family starve to death," he said. "I am obliged to work, to take responsibility. I have to handle it so I can bring in money." During his last job, at a coffee shop, Ali used to wake up at 2 p.m. every day to go to work and return home around dawn. He would sweep floors and serve customers water pipes, with a maximum of five dinars (\$7) in his pocket at the end of the shift. His employer often withheld some of that money and still owes him 63 dinars (\$100), Ali said. Ali's mother, 40-year-old Khalida, is worried about him. "I am scared when he's walking back home somebody will hit him or say something to him. I am afraid for him, a lot," she said. "Sometimes I just call him and tell him to hell with work, just come home." — AP

LONE MIGRANT RESCUE SHIP KEEPS UP PATROLS OFF LIBYA

UNDISCLOSED LOCATION: On board the Aquarius, one of the last NGO ships still operating off the coast of Libya, rescuers are worried they are not seeing any more boatloads of migrants at sea. Libya's navy last week ordered foreign vessels to stay out of a coastal "search and rescue zone" for migrants headed for Europe, a measure aimed at nongovernmental organizations it accuses of facilitating traffickers in illegal migration. One by one the NGOs halted operations, except the Aquarius. The 68metre orange boat, formerly used by the German coastguard, sailed alone off the Libyan coast on Sunday.

"For the moment, we are continuing our patrol operation in international waters," said Nicola Stall, search and rescue coordinator for the Aquarius, which is operated by SOS Mediterranee and Doctors Without Borders (MSF). And so the Aquarius team of rescuers keeps up its two-hour rotation, day and night, to watch for migrants floating on overcrowded and unseaworthy boats. MSF workers meanwhile check their stocks of medications, while other volunteers give the bridge a fresh coat of paint.

As they wait, they are concerned about the calm sea and the favorable winds of the past few days. Despite such weather conditions, they haven't seen a migrant boat for a week now. "It's very hard to know what is going on in Libya," says Marcella Kraay, the MSF chief on board. Even during the bad weather in winter, they have never gone more than three weeks without rescuing hundreds of migrants. "What we're seeing at sea is that it seems fewer small boats are leaving Libya, and those that do leave are intercepted by the Libyan coastguards," she says, adding that they were trying to get Libya to clarify the zone that foreign ships are barred from. The Aquarius may be joined by vessels from the Spanish charity Proactiva Open Arms, which was expected to resume operations on Monday.

Warning shots

Last week Libyan coastguards frightened off most NGO rescue ships when they fired shots in the air opposite one vessel, warning that they would target it directly the next time. The Aquarius has an emergency plan so everyone on board can lock themselves in should the ship be boarded. There are about a dozen people from the two NGOs, from several European countries as well as the United States and Australia.

Sailors volunteer their time to SOS Mediterranee while the MSF team includes doctors as well as logistical and technical people, veterans of humanitarian crises such as the Ebola epidemic and the Iraqi battle at Mosul. The ship's captain hails from Belarus and the roughly 10 crew members are mostly Slavs, hired with the boat but having chosen to take part in this rescue mission, which has been going on

At night the Aquarius keeps about 30 miles from the Libyan coast, mainly to avoid fishermen's nets. During the day it moves closer so the coastline is visible, but stays about 24 miles away unless the Italian coastguard calls on them to help with rescues nearer shore. Six years since a revolution that toppled longtime dictator Moamer Kadhafi, Libya has become a key departure point for migrants risking their lives to cross the Mediterranean to Europe.

'Grave concern'

Italy, which has borne the brunt of the migrant influx from north Africa, has welcomed Libya's decision to bar NGO ships and invest more in its coastguard. The number of migrants reaching Italy is down compared with last year. So far in August authorities say there have been 1,700 arrivals, far from the 21,300 recorded for the entire month in 2016. But for humanitarian groups, what happens to migrants returned to or kept in camps in Libya is even more worrying. "Fewer ships in the area will mean more people will drown at sea. And those taken back by the Libyan coastguards will be kept in captivity, and again exposed to violence, abuse, maltreatment, exortion," says MSF's Kraay. "This is really a grave concern." —AFP

SYRIAN REBELS HEAD HOME AS US GIVES LEBANON COMBAT VEHICLES

BEIRUT: Hundreds of Syrian rebels and civilians started leaving the Lebanon-Syria border area yesterday after a deal was reached for their departure following days of delay, the media arm of Lebanon's militant Hezbollah group said. In Beirut, meanwhile, the United State handed over to the Lebanese army eight Bradley Fighting Vehicles, part of a total of 32 that will be delivered over the coming months in US support for the Lebanese military.

At the border, buses carrying members of the Levant People's Brigades rebel group started moving from the badlands of the Lebanese border town of Arsal in the direction of the Syrian village of Fleeta. More than 3,000 people were expected to leave by the end of the day. The evacuation comes nearly two weeks after more

than 7,000 Syrians, many of them al-Qaidalinked fighters and their families, left Arsal, following an offensive by Hezbollah.

The Levant People's Brigades whose members did not take part in last month's battles will be heading to the Syrian government-held town of Ruhaiba, about 50 kilometers northeast of the Syrian capital, Damascus, where they will return to normal life following an amnesty by the state, according to Hezbollah's Al-Manar TV. The only insurgents remaining on Lebanon's side of the border now are members of the Islamic State group - hundreds of IS fighters control a stretch of land that is almost equally split between Lebanon and Syria.

The Lebanese army has been preparing an attack on IS-held areas for weeks there, sending in reinforcements and pounding the area with artillery shells and rockets. The Syrian army and Hezbollah are also preparing for a simultaneous attack on IS on the Syrian side of the border. At the Bradley handover ceremony at Beirut's port, US Ambassador Elizabeth Richard said the vehicles represent an investment of over \$100 million that will "provide the Lebanese Armed Forces with new capabilities to protect Lebanon, to protect its borders and to fight terrorists." The US has supplied the Lebanese military with Cessna aircraft that discharge Hellfire missiles, helicopters, anti-tank missiles, artillery and radars, as well as training. The American Embassy says the US has provided Lebanon with over \$1.4 billion in security assistance since

FOILED IS-LED SUICIDE BOMB ATTACKS IN MOSCOW: POLICE

MOSCOW: Russia's FSB security service said yesterday that it had captured a gang planning major attacks on Moscow transport networks and shopping centers, directed by members of the Islamic State jihadist group from Syria. Security officers detained members of the group outside Moscow as they plotted "a series of terrorist attacks in crowded public places including on public transport and in major shopping centers in Moscow using suicide bombers and powerful explosive devices," the FSB said.

It said it had determined that the attacks were being organized by IS warlords and emissaries who are in Syria, which it identified as TM Nazarov and AM Shirindzhonov. Media outlets in Taiikistan reported this month that a man named Todzhiddin Nazarov, also known as Abu Osama Noraka, had appeared in IS video statements from Syria posted on pro-jihadist sites. The FSB said officers raided a bomb-making laboratory outside Moscow and captured the group's coordinator, an IS emissary in as a hero a 24-year-old officer stabbed to death by a Russia, as well as an explosives expert and two suspected member of the Islamic State (IS) group,

potential suicide bombers, it said. It said that four people were captured, three from Central Asian states and one a Russian citizen. Russia's Rossiya 24 state television showed FSB footage of the raid on a house in which plainclothes officers are seen pinning two young men wearing black rucksacks to the floor and handcuffing them. It also showed what it said was equipment used to mix chemicals. Russia regularly announces that it has foiled major terrorist attacks, and recently has emphasized the threat from former Soviet countries in Central Asia, where large numbers of the Muslim-majority populations have gone to fight alongside IS. The FSB said in July that it had detained seven nationals from Central Asia who were "preparing terrorist attacks" in Saint Petersburg, where 15 were killed in a metro bombing in April.

Elsewhere, Istanbul's police chief yesterday hailed

who had been arrested for allegedly planning a suicide attack. Sinan Acar was attacked with a knife by the suspect, who has not been named, after the man was brought by car for questioning to the headquarters of Istanbul police late Sunday.

Acar later died of his wounds while the suspected IS member was shot dead on the spot by other police officers. Speaking at a funeral ceremony for the slain officer, police chief Mustafa Caliskan said Acar and his colleagues had prevented a potentially significant attack by arresting the suspect. "The man arrested was someone who was the subject of an international search," said Caliskan. "We think that a very serious attack was prevented."

"It must be known that in this country people like Sinan will live on," he said at the ceremony also attended by Istanbul governor Vasip Sahin. It was not immediately clear how the suspect managed to keep a knife while being taken into custody. At the funeral, Acar's mother, overcome by emotion, was supported by a female police officer, an AFP corre-

spondent said. He will later be buried in his native Bursa region.

Turkey was hit in 2016 by a succession of attacks that left hundreds dead in the bloodiest year of terror strikes in its history. The attacks were blamed on IS jihadists as well as the outlawed Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) who have battled the Turkish state in an insurgency lasting more than three decades. Last month anti-terror officers in Istanbul detained dozens of alleged IS members, several of whom were said to be preparing a "sensational attack" in Turkey, police said.

An attack by a jihadist gunman on an elite nightclub in Istanbul just 75 minutes into New Year's Day in 2017 left 39 people dead, mainly foreigners. There has since been a lull in similar attacks, but tensions and high security remain in big cities. Turkey was in the last years criticised by NATO allies for not doing more against the rise of IS but recent months have seen near daily raids on the group's cells inside the country. — AFP

FRENCH 'FALLING OUT OF LOVE' WITH MACRON AFTER 100 DAYS

NO PRESIDENT HAS SEEN SUCH A STEEP DROP IN POPULARITY

PARIS: Emmanuel Macron, the 39-year-old former investment banker who was catapulted to the French presidency in May, faces widespread disillusionment as he prepares to mark his first 100 days in office. The man shown walking on water on the cover of The Economist magazine after his startling rise has seen his approval ratings nosedive, with only 36 percent of respondents giving him the thumbs up in one recent poll. The French are "falling out of love" with

political cost of his decisions," leading pollster Jerome Fourquet told AFP. Proposed defense cuts — part of a plan to trim 4.5 billion euros (\$5.3 billion) to bring France's budget deficit within EU limits — led to a public row last month with the head of the French armed forces, General Pierre de Villiers.

'Honeymoon is over' Macron rebuked him for questioning the wisMarine Le Pen. His victory over the populist Le Pen was deceptive, as it came with a record low turnout and followed a first round in which only one in four voters picked Macron. In June, Macron's Republic on the Move party and its centrist ally MoDem won a comfortable majority in parliament — but after garnering less than half the vote, also on a historically low turnout.

Holding his own

Macron has fared better on the diplomacy front, proving himself a match for US President Donald Trump in the handshake department and holding his own with Russia's Vladimir Putin. And amid anguish over Brexit, Macron's committed pro-EU stance has roused hopes of a revival of the Franco-German axis that forged European integration and created the world's biggest trade bloc.

Macron has fulfilled a key campaign promise, winning passage of legislation to clean up politics following a series of scandals, and tough new anti-terror measures are in the pipeline. But prominent right-wing politician Eric Woerth scoffed that "nothing difficult has been done yet". Government spokesman Christophe Castaner has sought to deflect criticism of his boss ahead of Tuesday, which will mark 100 days since the election.

The president has "laid the foundation of a deep transformation of our country," Castaner said in a Facebook post on Sunday. The young president will come back from summer holidays to face protests against his labor reforms, with unions calling for strikes and marches while the radical left France Unbowed party plans a "people's rally". Parliament this month adopted a bill allowing the government to fast-track changes to the labor code to give employers more power to negotiate directly with their employees.

One bright spot for Macron is the overwhelming popularity enjoyed by his wife Brigitte, who has taken to her role with aplomb, shrugging off chatter about the 25-year age gap with her husband. Always poised and smiling, often sporting above-the-knee Louis Vuitton dresses, the svelte blonde who was once Macron's drama coach will "play a very active role alongside her husband, who will benefit from her incredible popularity," wrote the Paris

SUPERHEROES: PORTUGAL'S FIREFIGHTERS WORK FOR FREE

LISBON: Almost all of the 2,000 Portuguese firefighters at a weeklong wildfire that killed 64 people this summer had something in common apart from the acute danger they faced: they were doing it for no pay and with equipment bought with public donations. More than 90 percent of Portugal's around 30,000 firefighters are volunteers. From lawyers to construction workers, they take time off work to risk their lives. What's more, the volunteer fire departments where they work rely on donations and income from working at private events to pay for their equipment.

When they are deployed to a wildfire outside their area of residence during the summer fire season, the government pays these intrepid men and women 1.87 euros (\$2) an hour. And the volunteer firefighters usually hand over that meager stipend to their financially stretched fire departments. Hugo Simoes, a 33-year-old Lisbon bombeiro (firefighter) who was deployed in June to the country's deadliest wildfire on record, says a sense of duty and brotherhood drives the volunteers. "We do it out of community spirit," he says.

Volunteers are not uncommon in fire brigades in Europe and further afield - more than 97 percent of German firefighters are volunteers; in the US that figure is around 70 percent. But in Portugal these unfunded services are the front line in emergencies, providing the backbone of the Civil Protection Agency's resources. There are just seven professional fire departments in the country. Simoes works for Portugal's oldest fire department, the Bombeiros Voluntarios de Lisboa, created in 1868 by royal decree. For him, the volunteer spirit shown by generations of firefighters is unremarkable. It's a cultural tradition.

Massive blaze

"Here in Portugal it's been like this for a long time," he shrugs. "We like what we do. On hot days when we could go to the beach, we come here to the fire department instead, to help out." Simoes nowadays works full-time as an administrative clerk at the fire department, earning around 600 euros a month. When the alarms rang in June to go and help at a massive blaze in woodland around Pedrogao Grande, about 150 kilometers north of Lisbon, Simoes set off with four vehicles and their crews. "Some walked out of work and risked being marked as absent," Simoes says. Across the country, other volunteer firefighters did the same. Scorching weather, as well as strong winds and woodland that was bone dry after months with little rain, fueled the Pedrogao Grande blaze, just as it has other forest fires this summer. The fire spread so quickly that 47 people died on a road as they fled the advancing flames in their cars. "The stress, the adrenaline, the heat - they demand a huge effort," Simoes said. "At times it can get a bit hairy, but our training kicks in."

Similar scenes play out each summer in Portugal: giant flames dwarf the firefighters, huge clouds of smoke stretch to the horizon, locals help out with buckets and garden hoses and swat at the flames with broken-off tree branches. Wildfires race through eucalyptus and pine forests that are uncleared and tightly packed. This year has been particularly bad, due to a severe drought gripping 80 percent of the country. Wildfires in Portugal accounted for more than one-third of the burnt forest in the entire 28-nation

European Union up to Aug 5. Last week, Simoes and his team were dispatched to a major forest fire in Abrantes, not far from Pedrogao Grande. Firefighters brought the blaze under control within 48 hours. The volunteer firefighters are commonly depicted as heroes in Portugal. A recent fund-raising campaign described them as "heroes without capes." Calls for food and water to help the firefighters inevitably bring a nationwide deluge of donations.

About 80 people are on call at the Bombeiros Voluntarios de Lisboa. They receive more than 300 hours of training, which is also done outside their day job. Simoes says the department has always had enough staff, though it is stretched in emergencies. It scrapes by financially. Fire suits cost almost 2,000 euros each. The recent purchase of 100 new helmets cost 28,000 euros. Portugal's volunteer fire departments often use vehicles bought second-hand. In Lisbon, that includes a fire truck purchased in Luxembourg. A new one costs more than 250,000 euros - way beyond their budget. Their dream, they confide, is to own a big American fire truck. — AP

VENEZUELA PENCE THREADS NEEDLE ON

CARTAGENA: Vice President Mike Pence is demonstrating the delicate balancing act that has thus far defined his term, walking a line during a trip to Latin America between the region's opposition to possible US military intervention in Venezuela, and President Donald Trump's surprising refusal to rule out that option.

Speaking during a joint news conference with Colombian president Juan Manuel Santos shortly after his arrival Sunday, Pence also declined to rule out possible military action against Venezuelan President Nicol·s Maduro, whose efforts to consolidate power in the country have drawn alarm. Still, Pence stressed the US would much prefer what he called a "peaceable" solution to the growing political and humanitarian crisis. "President Trump is a leader who says what he means and means what he says," Pence said. "But the president sent me here to continue to marshal the unprecedented support of countries across Latin America to achieve by peaceable means the restoration of democracy in Venezuela, and we believe it is achievable by those means."

Venezuela crisis

Trump's startling comments Friday sparked backlash across the region, including from Venezuela's chief opposition coalition and the Colombian government. Standing at Pence's side in Cartagena after the two met, Santos said he had repeatedly told Pence in no uncertain terms that the US must not even consider military action in response to Venezuela's crisis.

The two countries are important allies, Santos said. "But since friends have to tell each other the truth, I have told Vice President Pence that the possibility of a military intervention shouldn't even be considered, neither in Colombia nor in Latin America," Santos said through a translator. "America is a continent of peace. It is the land of peace. Let us preserve it as such."

Analysists said Trump's comments played into Maduro's hands by awakening dark memories of US intervention in the region and making it harder for other Latin American countries to join the anti-Maduro coalition. "The phantom of military interventions in Latin America disappeared a long time ago, and we don't want it to return," Santos said. Pence emphasized the US will work

together with many nations in Venezuela's "neighborhood" to pressure Maduro so that democracy can be restored. "We simply will not accept the emergence of a dictatorship in our hemisphere," he said, continuing the tough talk that has been Trump's approach to Maduro. "The United States will not stand by as Venezuela crumbles," he said.

Pence also addressed the deadly violence that broke out Saturday during a march by white supremacists in Charlottesville, Virginia, using words the president would not. "We have no tolerance for hate and violence, white supremacists or neo-Nazis or the KKK," Pence said. "These dangerous fringe groups have no place in American public life and in the American debate, and we condemn them in the strongest possible terms."

Trump has been criticized by both Democrats and Republicans for not singling out those groups directly in a lengthy Saturday statement and instead blaming "many sides" for the violence. Pence also addressed a spike in coca production in Colombia, saying the worsening crisis required "swift action to protect the people of both our countries." A July report from the United Nations showed that coca production in Colombia had reached levels not seen in two decades, complicating Colombia's efforts to make its vast, lawless countryside more secure.

Anti-narcotics policies

Venezuelan Vice President Tareck El Aissami lashed out at Pence, rejecting what he called "interventionist" comments intended to hide the failure of US anti-narcotics policies in Colombia. He dismissed Pence's meeting with Santos as "an encounter between the world's largest producer of drugs and the nation with the most consumers."

El Aissami was sanctioned by the Trump administration in February for allegedly running a drug trafficking network of corrupt officials in Venezuela. Pence and his wife, Karen, arrived Sunday in Colombia for a six-day, four-country trip through the region. Pence has other stops scheduled in Argentina, Chile and Panama, giving speeches and meeting with leaders. —AP

INDIA TO DEPORT ROHINGYA DESPITE UN REGISTRATION

NEW DELHI: All of an estimated 40,000 Rohingya Muslims living in India are illegal immigrants, even those registered with the UN refugee agency, and the government aims to deport them, a senior government official told Reuters. Junior interior minister Kiren Rijiju told parliament last week the central government had directed state authorities to identify and deport illegal immigrants including Rohingya, who face persecution in

Buddhist-majority Myanmar. The United Nations Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) has issued identity cards to about 16,500 Rohingya in India that it says help them "prevent harassment, arbitrary arrests, detention and deportation". But Rijiju, a high-profile minister in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Hindu nationalist government, said in an interview on the weekend that the UNHCR registration was irrelevant. "They are doing it, we can't stop them from registering. But we are not signatory to the accord on refugees," he said. "As far as we are concerned they are all illegal immigrants They have no basis to live here. Anybody who is illegal

migrant will be deported."

The UNHCR's India office said yesterday the principle of non-refoulement - or not sending back refugees to a place where they face danger - was considered part of customary international law and binding on all states whether they have signed the Refugee Convention or not. The office said it had not received any official word about a plan to deport Rohingya refugees, and had not got any reports deportations were taking place.

The treatment of the roughly one million Rohingya in Myanmar has emerged as its most contentious human rights issue as it makes a transition from decades of harsh military rule. The Rohingya are denied citizenship in Myanmar and classified as illegal immigrants, despite claiming roots there that go back centuries, with communities marginalized and occasionally subjected

to communal violence. Hundreds of thousands of Rohingya have fled from Myanmar, with many taking refuge in Bangladesh, and some then crossing a porous border into Hindumajority India. — Reuters

WILL N KOREA'S KIM PULL THE TRIGGER?

SEOUL: Tensions between the United States and North Korea tend to flare suddenly and fade almost as quickly - but the latest escalation won't likely go away quite so easily. Events closer to home, including deadly violence at a white nationalist rally in Virginia, could demand more of President Donald Trump's attention in the days ahead and cut into the volume and frequency of his fiery North Korea rhetoric. But North Korea has yet to back away from its biggest threat: a plan to lob missiles toward U.S. military bases on the island of Guam that Pyongyang says should be ready for leader Kim Jong Un to review anytime now. Will it all stop there?

Or, despite the extremely high risks, will Kim really give the go order? And, regardless of what Kim does or doesn't do, will the tough-talking Trump feel compelled to take matters into his own hands? Unpredictable as the situation is, some potential flashpoints to watch for:

Bomber flights

This could be the biggest trigger. North Korea says it was compelled to put the Guam plan together because it feels threatened by a squadron of B-1B bombers on the island that the US has increasingly sent to fly in Korean airspace in symbolic shows of force during times of particular tension. But that may be only a

North Korea is certainly sensitive to the bombers, which could cause a lot of dev-

just want an excuse to fully test the capabilities of its new Hwasong-12 intermediate-range missiles. Either way, it's a cagey tactic: If Trump orders the B-1Bs to stay on the ground, Pyongyang can claim victory. If he orders them to fly, North Korea has its excuse to launch. If, of course, that's what it really wants to do - Pyongyang wisely left itself a lot of wiggle room and hasn't committed itself one way or the other.

Tens of thousands of US and South Korean troops are expected to kick off the annual Ulchi-Freedom Guardian military exercises on Aug. 21. North Korea sees these exercises and larger ones held every spring as a rehearsal for invasion. Getting Washington to halt them has long been one of Pyongyang's key demands, and it regularly stirs the pot around the time they're held. North Korea carried out its biggest nuclear test just after last year's UFG drills ended and fired four Scud ER missiles into waters off Japan to coincide with the spring exercises this past March. This year's UFG exercises are expected to last around 10 days. —AP

Taiwan reports more Chinese military flights

Taiwan says it has tracked more Chinese military aircraft flying apparent training missions to the south and east of the island. The defense ministry said a pair of Chinese Y-8 surveillance aircraft flew through the Bashi Strait between Taiwan and the Philippines then out into the Pacific in a northeasterly direction on Sunday. It said the pair were joined at one point by two Chinese Su-30 fighter jets as they flew through the Miyako Strait north of the island.

That marked the third time this month that Chinese military planes were seen in the vicinity of Taiwanese air space, according to the official Central News Agency. Previous flights on Aug 5 and Aug 8 included Y-8s and other aircraft. China claims Taiwan as its own territory to be brought under its control by force if necessary, and the two share an overlapping claim to most of the South China Sea. However, Taiwan occupies just the largely uncontested Pratas islands and just one island in the hotly disputed Spratly chain, unlike Beijing, which has aggressively pursued its claims, including building seven man-made islands atop coral reefs and adding airstrips and other infrastructure of military usefulness.

China has also taken a tougher stance toward Taiwan since last year's election of independence-leaning President Tsai Ing-wen, who has refused to endorse Beijing's contention that Taiwan is part of the Chinese nation. The tougher stance has so far been limited largely to diplomatic and economic measures, although Chinese commentators frequently speculate on the potential need for military steps to bring additional pressure on Tsai.

Taiwan's defense ministry said the Chinese planes remained outside the island's air defense identification zone, and said the citizens had nothing to worry about. Taiwan has as recently as last month scrambled fighters to respond to the presence of China's planes but the ministry gave no indication it did so this time.

Chinese reclamation work continuing

A leading US think tank released a new report documenting what it said was continuing reclamation work on Chinese-controlled islands in the area, despite a recent claim by China's foreign minister that such work stopped

Foreign Minister Wang Yi said Aug. 7 that China had "stopped or already completed land reclamation" on its holdings in the South China Sea two years ago. China has built seven new islands in the Spratly chain by piling sand and cement atop coral reefs. However, the Washington-based Center for Strategic and International Studies said China was continuing to

BEIJING: A look at recent develop- reclaim land in the Paracel Islands north of the Spratlys.

Wang's claim "is false" and China's reclamation work "did not end in mid-2015 with the completion of its artificial islands in the Spratlys," said the report. The Paracels play "a key role in China's goal of establishing surveillance and power projection capabilities throughout the South China Sea," the report said. "To this end, Beijing has undertaken substantial upgrades of its military infrastructure in the Paracels." China occupies 20 outposts in the chain and improvements include the addition of harbors, helipads, an airstrip, hangars and a surface-to-air missile battery, the report said.

China expresses dissatisfaction with US

China expressed its "strong dissatisfaction" with the US over the Navy's latest freedom of navigation operation in which a warship sailed past one of China's man-made islands. In a statement late Thursday, Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Geng Shuang called the US Navy's action a "provocation" that "severely undermines China's sovereignty and security, and severely endangers the safety of frontline personnel of both sides."

China routinely protests such operations, which President Donald Trump's administration has continued partly to reassure allies locked in territorial disputes with Beijing. The US move will "compel China to take measures to further raise its capacity to defend national territory," Geng said, adding that the Chinese navy "identified the U.S. warship, warned and expelled it." A US Navy official told The Associated Press that the destroyer USS John S. McCain sailed past Mischief Reef on Thursday but gave no details.

Tillerson visits Malaysia

US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson visited Thailand and Malaysia last week, in an effort to shore up relations with two of America's Southeast Asian allies and urge them to maintain pressure on North Korea. Malaysia exercises claims in the South China Sea, while Thailand lies outside the dispute. Both have been cultivating closer ties to key trading partner Beijing, raising consternation in Washington, which had angered the country's rulers by raising concerns over human rights, attacks on political rivals and corruption.

Tillerson flew to Bangkok from the Philippines, where he had met with his counterparts from the 10-member Association of Southeast Asian Nations at an annual regional gathering that focused heavily on North Korea's push to advance its nuclear weapons and missile programs. Deputy Prime Minister Zahid Hamidi said in a statement they held talks Wednesday, centered on security issues including terrorism and human trafficking as well as bilateral and international issues. Tillerson had met Prime Minister Najib Razak after arriving late Tuesday from Bangkok. During a visit by Najib to Beijing last year, China and Malaysia said their navies will cooperate more in the South China Sea. —AP

PAKISTAN MARKS 70 YEARS OF INDEPENDENCE WITH AIR SHOW

MILITARY'S TOP BRASS VOWED TO WIPE OUT TERRORISTS

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan yesterday celebrated 70 years of independence from British India with a patriotic display including a giant flag and a show of airpower, as the military's top brass vowed to wipe out terrorists days after a deadly blast. Celebrations began at the stroke of midnight with firework shows in major cities.

At the highly symbolic Wagah eastern border crossing with India, army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa raised a massive national flag on a 400 foot (122metre) pole as crowds chanted patriotic slogans. Following the chest-thumping performance Bajwa said the country was making progress and promised to "go after each and every terrorist in Pakistan". "We have made a few mistakes in the past, but we are on the road to development under the guidance of our constitution," he added.

A powerful bomb targeted a military vehicle in the restive capital of Balochistan province late Saturday, killing 14 people including several troops. The military later said the blast, claimed by the Islamic State group, was intended to mar Independence Day celebrations. Pakistan also faces fresh political turmoil after the Supreme Court last month sacked Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif following an investigation into corruption allegations against his family. In Islamabad his newlyelected successor Shahid Khagan Abbasi, along with top generals and foreign dignitaries, presided over a 31-gun salute and flag-raising ceremony to mark the holiday.

"The independence that we got 70 years ago was the fruit of the exemplary struggle of our ancestors," said Abbasi in an address to the nation. "Thousands of Muslims have made sacrifices through the eastern city's streets for our future and the future of our children." Further south in Karachi the day began with a changing of the guard at the mausoleum of the country's founder Mohammad Ali Jinnah, where politicians and military commanders laid floral wreaths.

Up north in the Swat valley near the restive border with Afghanistan celebrations were more subdued, with events at schools cancelled due to "prevailing law and order" issues. In nearby Peshawar, the capent states — Hindu-majority India and Muslim-majority Pakistan. Millions were uprooted in one of the largest mass migrations in history, with experts estimating at least one million died in the communal violence unleashed by partition. AUSTRALIAN DEPUTY PM **UNDER CITIZENSHIP CLOUD**

CANBERRA: Australia's deputy prime minister yesterday became the latest lawmaker to reveal he might have breached a constitutional prohibition on dual citizens becoming lawmakers, after the New Zealand government declared he was a kiwi. Barnaby Joyce told Parliament he would become the fifth lawmaker to be referred to the High Court since last month for scrutiny over whether he was entitled to remain in Parliament. Joyce, who leads the conservative Nationals minor coalition party, said he had legal advice that he would be cleared by the court and would not stand down from Cabinet.

The 116-year-old section of the constitution that bans dual nationals is taking an extraordinary toll on the finely balanced Parliament elected in July last year. Before the careers of five came under a cloud since July, only two elected lawmakers were caught. Both were elected in the late 1990s and were quickly disqualified by the High Court, the first over New Zealand citizenship and the second for being British. Critics of the constitutional rule argue it no longer suits the modern multicultural Australia in which almost half the population was born overseas or has at least

one overseas-born parent. If Joyce was disqualified, Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull's center-right government could lose its singleseat majority in the House of Representatives where parties need a majority to govern. The other four lawmakers are senators who if disqualified would be replaced by members of their own parties. Joyce said he was notified by the New Zealand High Commission on Thursday that the New Zealand government had discovered "I may be a citizen by descent of New Zealand."

"Needless to say, I was shocked to receive this information," said Joyce, whose father migrated from New Zealand in 1947. Joyce was born in Australia in 1967. New Zealand Prime Minister Bill English said he was told last week that Joyce was a New Zealand citizen. "Unwittingly or not, he's (Joyce) a New Zealand citizen and then it's a matter for the Australian system to decide how Australian law applies in his case and how they deal with the issue," English said.

The Australian opposition demanded that the government refuse to accept Joyce's vote in Parliament and dump him from Cabinet until the court resolved his status. But Turnbull said he was confident that Joyce was eligible to sit in Parliament. "We did not refer this matter to the court because of any doubt about the Member for New England's (Joyce's) position, but because of the need, plainly in the public interest, to give the court the opportunity to clarify the operation of the section (of the constitution) so important to the operation of our Parliament,"Turnbull told Parliament. —AP

TENSIONS NOT KEEPING TOURISTS FROM GUAM

HAGATNA: Tourists haven't been deterred from visiting the tropical island of Guam even though the US territory has been the target of threats from North Korea during a week of angry words exchanged by Pyongyang and Washington. Chiho Tsuchiya of Japan heard the news, but she decided to come anyway with her husband and two children. "I feel Japan and Korea also can get danger from North Korea, so staying home is the same," said the 40-year-old.

Won Hyung-jin, an official from Modetour, a large South Korean travel agency, said several customers called with concerns, but they weren't worried enough to pay cancellation fees for their trips. "It seems North Korea racks up tension once or twice every year, and travelers have become insensitive about it," Won said. His company has sent about 5,000 travelers to Guam a month this year, mostly on package tours.

The US territory has a population of 160,000, but it attracted 1.5 million visitors last year. One third of Guam's jobs are in the tourism industry. Guam is a key outpost for the US military, which uses it as a base for bombers and submarines. The island's sandy beaches and aquamarine waters make it a popular getaway for travelers from Japan and South Korea. Guam is only about three hours by plane from major cities in both countries.

Low-cost airlines

The number of South Korean travelers in particular has been growing lately because five low-cost airlines started flying to Guam from South Korea, said Antonio Muna, the vice president of Guam Visitors Bureau. This helped boost arrival figures to a 20-year-high in July, Muna said. The threats came in a week in which longstanding tensions

between the countries risked abruptly boiling over. New United Nations sanctions co demning the North's rapidly developing nuclear program drew fresh ire and threats from Pyongyang. President Donald Trump responded by vowing to rain down "fire and fury" if challenged. The North then threatened

to lob missiles near Guam. Kenji Kikuchi, 39, arrived from Japan last week and planned to leave Tuesday as scheduled. He was aware of the threat from reading the local newspaper and was a little worried. But he said North Korea's missiles would fall in the water not on Guam. His 8-year-old son and 4-year-old daughter weren't concerned. "They talk about it, but they don't care about it. So they like the sea

and the pool," he said. The Guam Visitors Bureau has heard reports of cancellations, but Muna said it doesn't yet have any concrete figures on how many took place. Officials are still expecting a strong August, Muna said. "Japan and Korea make over 90 percent of our arrivals. And they're much closer to North Korea than Guam is," Muna said. The agency has been relaying assurances from the governor and defense officials that Guam is protected and safe, he said. Trump told Guam's Republican governor the global attention would send more tourists to the island.

"You're going to go up like tenfold with the expenditure of no money," he told Gov. Eddie Calvo in a telephone conversation Calvo posted Sunday on Facebook. Trump said he'd been watching scenes of Guam on the news, and "it just looks like a beautiful place." Calvo replied: "It's paradise." "We've got 95 percent occupancy and after all this stuff calms down, we're going to have 110 percent occupancy," Calvo said. —AP

70 YRS OF PAIN ON INDIA-PAK BORDER

rom barbed grins in a carefully synchronized daily flag ceremony to murderous exchanges across barbed wire in Kashmir, the India-Pakistan border is a 70-year-old scar that will not heal. Thousands cheered at the Wagah border crossing this week as the two countries celebrate the anniversaries of their independence, when British India was carved into two nations.

The upheaval that followed left at least one million dead in a brutal migration that took millions of Muslims to Pakistan and millions of Hindus to India. But all these years after the trauma of Partition, they have not agreed a border, nor their history - Pakistan marks independence on August 14 each year, India one day later. And the killing goes on.

Wagah, near Amritsar, is the only functioning border post between the rivals. The flag ceremony there draws crowds of up to 20,000 each day. There is wild applause as pumped-up troops, their eyes bulging, perform a stamping march toward the border gates at sundown. The flags are lowered, a soldier from each side shakes hands with a forced smile and the gates close.

Fists occasionally fly between Indian and Pakistani soldiers during the ceremony, but there is worse along the border. Kashmir, divided between the rivals and claimed by both, is on a permanent conflict alert with near daily clashes and shelling across the Line of Control (LoC), the official name of the disputed frontier. A woman relative of 28-year-old Muhammad Haseeb was killed as she worked in a field in the Nakyal sector on the Pakistani side just days before the partition anniversary. "We don't know when we will become the victim of a bullet," he said.

Tens of thousands, mainly civilians, have died in Muslim-majority Indian Kashmir in the past 30 years. India says about 40 militants have been killed this year trying to sneak across the border. Nine Indian soldiers have been killed on the LoC. Prospects for improvement look slim.

Entente needed

Cricket is the national game for both countries, but they have not played a five-day Test match against each other in either country since 2007. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi went to Pakistan in 2015. But ties are in deep freeze again since Pakistan detained and sentenced to death Kulbushan Jadhav, a former Indian naval officer it accuses of espionage. For most politicians, observers and activists, India and Pakistan just cannot get over its split.

Pakistan has been in new political chaos with Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif ousted over corruption allegations. But some on both sides blame Modi's hardline stance. "So long as there is a Hindu India that acts like a mirror to a Muslim Pakistan I don't see any chance of a reconciliation," said Mani Shankar Aiyar, an outspoken former Indian minister who as a diplomat was his country's first consul general in the Pakistani city of Lahore. Aiyar says that India and Pakistan need an Anglo-French style "Entente Cordiale" and then to get down to serious talks. Prominent Pakistani political analyst Hasan Askari said both countries have grievances and that relations can barely get any worse. "The present tension between India and Pakistan is unnatural. Therefore I don't expect this to stay as it is for all the time to come," he told AFP. "As no dialogue is taking place, this relationship is really bad," he added. "India has truly reduced this relationship to a single issue - terrorism - whereas the Pakistani argument is that we can talk about all contentious issues. They can be put on the table and discussed."

Askari said there could be no talks while India obsesses about militant activity. "This means there's hardly any possibility of a dialogue in the near future because the government of Pakistan can't even commit to its own people that there'll be no terrorist activity, not to speak of any commitment to India."

Away from the politics and military posturing, Guneeta Singh Ballah, founder of the 1947 Partition Archive that has interviewed thousands of survivors of the partition, sees hope in the new generation on either side of the frontier. "The generation who did not go through the death and destruction had more hatred for the other side than their parents," she said. "I think that the new generation is more engaged in wanting to get over the past," she said. If millions of expatriate Pakistanis and Indians can get along in the United States, Australia, Britain and the Middle East "why can't they make it work at home?" she asked. —AFP

WHY WON'T TRUMP CONDEMN WHITE NATIONALISM?

hy doesn't US President Donald Trump just unequivocally condemn white supremacists? It's a jarring question to ask about an American president. But it's also one made unavoidable by Trump's delayed, blame-both-sides response to the violence that erupted Saturday when neo-Nazis, skinheads and members of the Ku Klux Klan protested in Charlottesville, Virginia. Trump has faced such a moment before - one that would have certainly drawn swift, almost predictable condemnations from his recent predecessors, regardless of party. As a candidate and now as president, when racial tensions flared or fringe groups rallied around his message, Trump has shown uncharacteristic caution and a reluctance to distance himself from the hate.

At times, his approach has seemingly inflamed racial tensions in a deeply divided country while emboldening groups long in the shadows. On Saturday, as Trump read slowly through a statement about the clashes that left dozens injured and one woman dead, he condemned hatred, bigotry and violence "on many sides." The president was silent when journalists asked whether he rejected the support of nationalist groups. That silence was cheered by the white supremacist website Daily Stormer: "When asked to condemn, he just walked out of the room. Really, really good. God bless him."

Trump denies that he's racist or sympathetic to such groups. Son-in-law Jared Kushner, the grandson of Holocaust survivors, and daughter Ivanka, who converted to Judaism, are among those who have defended the president against those charges. Still, he has a history of engaging in high-profile, racially fraught battles. Early in his career as a developer, Trump fought charges of bias against blacks seeking to rent at his family-owned apartment complexes. He long promoted the lie that the nation's first black president, Barack Obama, was not born in the United States. As a candidate, he proposed temporarily banning Muslims from the United States. He retweeted a post from accounts that appeared to have ties to white nationalist groups. And he was slow to reject the endorsement of former KKK leader David Duke.

Some of the president's friends and advisers have argued that Trump is simply refusing to bend to liberals' desire for political correctness. A boastful, proudly disruptive politician, Trump often has been rewarded for saying impolite and impolitic things. Some supporters cheered him for being someone who said what they could not. Democrats frequently assert that Trump sees a political advantage in courting the support of the far right. Indeed, he has benefited politically from the backing of media outlets such as Breitbart or InfoWars. They have consistently promoted Trump and torn down his opponents, sometimes with biased or inaccurate reports.

Charlottesville's mayor, Democrat Mike Signer, said Sunday that Trump made a choice during his campaign to "go right to the gutter, to play on our worst prejudices". "I think you are seeing a direct line from what happened here this weekend to those choices," Signer said on CBS' "Face the Nation". White House senior adviser Steve Bannon ran Breitbart before joining Trump's campaign, and several of the president's other aides believe Bannon continues to have influence over the website. In "Devil's Bargain," a new book about his role in the Trump campaign, Bannon is quoted as saying that attempts by Democratic presidential nominee

Hillary Clinton to tie Trump to the alt-right and nationalists did not move voters. "We polled the race stuff and it doesn't matter," Bannon said, according to the book. But there is no reliable public polling on the scope of Trump's support among those with white nationalist leanings or the percentage of the electorate they comprise. The reaction from Republicans following Trump's statement Saturday suggests there may be greater political risks for the president in aligning himself with bigoted groups.

"The president needs to step up today and say what it is," said Sen Cory Gardner, who was one of several GOP lawmakers urging Trump to be more strident in calling out the nationalists and neo-Nazis that gathered in Charlottesville. Gardner said plainly: "It's

evil. It's white nationalism." By Sunday, the White House was scrambling to try to clean up the president's statement. The White House issued a statement saying the president does condemn "white supremacists, KKK, neo-Nazi and all extremist groups".

The spokeswoman who issued the statement refused to be named. And the president himself remained silent. That left Vice President Mike Pence, traveling in South America, to offer the kind of comment Trump's critics sought from the White House: "We have no tolerance for hate and violence, white supremacists or neo-Nazis or the KKK," he said. "These dangerous fringe groups have no place in American public life and in the American debate, and we condemn them in the strongest possible terms".—AP

KIM AND TRUMP: A TALE OF 2 LEADERS

n many ways the two leaders on either side of North Korea-United States missile stand-off could not be more different. In others they are startlingly similar. North Korea's Kim Jong-Un has just overseen his second test of an intercontinental ballistic missile, bringing much of the US mainland within reach and presenting US President Donald Trump with a crisis. But while Pyongyang has long issued bellicose threats of nuclear war, this time it is the leader of the United States of America who is declaring that his weapons are "locked and loaded" and promising "fire and fury like the world has never seen".

"Donald Trump is probably the unlikeliest president of the United States you could possibly imagine, whereas Kim Jong-Un was the chosen heir," says John Delury, an associate professor at Yonsei University in Seoul. Kim's father and predecessor Kim Jong-II had groomed his son to take his place at the top of Pyongyang's political pyramid for years before his death in 2011.

For his part Trump reached the White House via a career in property development and reality television, followed by an unprecedentedly populist election campaign that upended the US political establishment. While Kim was a youthful ingenue when he came to power and remains among the world's youngest leaders - he has now held office for several years, while Trump, a grandfather in his 70s, is in his first political post. "It's a weird situation where he is much more experienced than Donald Trump, who is twice as old as him," says Delury.

Kim "probably thinks he's going to be around after Trump is gone", he points out. "Because he's the heir of what appears to be a pretty stable, dynastic state means he has a longer time horizon than most people." And with a universally loyal media in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, as the North is officially known, and no social media, Kim has no need to concern himself about tomorrow's headlines - or respond to them on

Family values

Both men "prize loyalty", says Delury, and are willing to employ "a high level of flux in personnel to ensure that it's their people who are running the system. That's a commonality between Kim and Trump." They also both deploy relatives in government. Dynastic descent from the North's founder Kim Il-Sung is the basis of Kim's personal legitimacy - Pyongyang's propaganda promotes the similarities between them in looks, mannerisms and even handwriting - and several members of the Kim family hold influential positions.

In Washington, Trump's daughter Ivanka is an assistant to the president, her husband Jared Kushner is a close advisor, and Trump's son Donald Jr has been embroiled in the investigation into alleged Russian influence in last year's election. Family politics are "formalized in the North Korean system but it's been introduced through the Trump family in a way that's unnerving to some Americans", says Delury. "There's another analogy there."

Now the two sides are locked in a cycle of threat and counter-threat, with Pyongyang revealing a plan to send a salvo of missiles towards the US Pacific territory of Guam. North Korea has been issuing hyperbolic threats for decades, such as turning Seoul into a "sea of fire" - one recent academic analysis of its language was titled "Turning it up to Eleven".

Pyongyang sees itself as defiantly facing down the menace from Washington, and anything fitting into that narrative bolsters the regime's claim to legitimacy. At the same time Trump has theatrical instincts. "This is the WWF part of Trump, reality TV, where each day is like a mini-show, and you need a foil, you need an enemy, you need a sense of drama and a good guy and bad guy, all these classic elements of popular entertainment," says Delury.

"While North Korea is a horrifically stupid choice as a place to fight a real war, it's a great place to fight a fake war. They will do this for four years, happily, keeping it at rhetorical Defcon 10. "It looks to me like they both really want this," he added. "I think they are thriving on it."—AFP

Trump 'military' talk unnerves Latam

S President Donald Trump's talk of a "military option" in Venezuela risks alienating Latin American nations that overcame their reluctance to work with the Republican leader and had adopted a common, confrontational approach aimed at isolating President Nicolas Maduro's embattled government. Well before Maduro himself responded, governments in Latin America with a long memory of US interventions were quick to express alarm over what sounded to them like saber-rattling. Even Colombia - Washington's staunchest ally in the region - condemned any "military measures and the use of force" that encroach on Venezuela's sovereignty.

Maduro has long accused Washington of having military designs on Venezuela and specifically its vast oil reserves, the world's largest. But those claims were dismissed by many as an attempt to distract from his government's failures to curb problems such as widespread shortages, spiraling inflation and one of the world's worst homicide rates. "For years he's been saying the US is preparing an invasion, and everyone laughed. But now the claim has been validated," said Mark Feierstein, who served as President Barack Obama's top national security adviser on Latin America. "It's hard to imagine a more damaging thing for Trump to say."

The timing of Trump's remarks could not

be worse, coming on the eve of a four-nation Latin America trip by Vice President Mike Pence intended to showcase how Washington and regional partners can work together to promote democracy in the hemisphere. This week in Peru, foreign ministers from 12 Western Hemisphere nations condemned the breakdown of democracy in Venezuela and refused to recognize a new, pro-government assembly created by Maduro that is charged with rewriting the constitution but is seen by many as an illegitimate power grab.

The United States did not take part in the meeting, a show of deference to countries historically mistrustful of heavy-handed policies out of Washington. Suspicion and resentment linger in many corners of the region, a reflection of years past when US troops did in fact invade parts of Latin America to oust leftist leaders or collect unpaid debts. Yet a number of leaders, amid prodding from the Trump administration, have lately been overcoming their reluctance to intervene in a neighbor's internal political affairs after looking the other ways for years on Venezuela.

Dictatorship

For the first time, leaders have started using the D-word - dictatorship - to describe Venezuela's government and have recalled their ambassadors from Caracas in protest.

Peru on Friday went so far as to expel Venezuela's ambassador, and last week the South American trade bloc Mercosur suspended Venezuela for violating the group's democratic norms. Even more surprising, with the exception of close ideological allies such as Cuba and Bolivia, no country spoke out against Trump's decision to slap sanctions on more than 30 Venezuelan officials, including Maduro himself, despite past criticism of similar unilateral actions.

cism of similar unilateral actions.

Not even the frustration over Trump's decision to partially roll back Obama's opening to Cuba - a diplomatic thaw that was applauded across the region's political spectrum - or his constant talk of building a border wall to keep out immigrants got in the way of presenting a united front toward Maduro. But the swift reaction to Trump's "military" remarks shows there is no appetite in the region for US troops to get involved

in the region for US troops to get involved.
On Saturday the nations of Mercosur, which includes Brazil and Argentina, issued a statement saying "the only acceptable means of promoting democracy are dialogue and diplomacy" and repudiating "violence and any option that implies the use of force". US engagement with other countries has not been constant and may have benefited more from the deteriorating situation in Venezuela than any concerted diplomatic outreach. US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson skipped a key

meeting of the Organization of American States in June, depriving some Caribbean countries that depend on Venezuelan oil shipments of the political cover they were looking for to abandon their support for Maduro.

Under the advice of Pence and Florida Republican Sen Marco Rubio, Trump appears to have taken a personal interest in Venezuela and even met at the White House with the wife of a prominent jailed opposition leader. That in turn has emboldened Maduro opponents who have been protesting for four months demanding he give up power. Their efforts could be undermined if Maduro expands his crackdown on dissent, arguing as he has in the past that their tactics are a prelude to a US-backed coup. Only this time he can point to Trump's words as evidence.

Pence arrives in Colombia on Sunday to begin his Latin America tour, during which discussions on how to deal with Venezuela were expected to feature prominently. Instead he may now be forced to do damage control, said Christopher Sabatini, executive director of Global Americans, a website focused on US policy in the region. "He's about to get an earful," Sabatini said. "The eagerness of Trump and some people around him to mouth off without any idea of context is really damaging not only to US policy but also regional stability.—AP

Sadr is one of few Iraqi Shiite leaders to keep some distance from Iran. In April, he became the first Iraqi Shiite leader to call on Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad to step down, marking his difference with Iran and Iranianbacked Iraqi militias backing the Syrian government. Earlier this month, Sadr called on the Baghdad government to dismantle the Hashed Al-Shaabi paramilitary group, which is dominated by Iran-backed Shiite militias. He has also called on the authorities to "seize the arsenal of all armed groups".

The Iraqi cleric's trip to Abu Dhabi comes two weeks after a visit to Saudi Arabia, where he met crown prince, Mohammed bin Salman. Sadr's office said his meeting with

Mohammed bin Salman at the end of July resulted in an agreement to study possible investments in Shiite regions of southern Iraq. The Saudis will consider the possibility of opening a consulate in Iraq's holy Shiite city of Najaf, it said. Sadr also announced a Saudi decision to donate \$10 million to help Iraqis displaced by the war on Islamic State in Iraq, to be paid to the Iraqi government.

Meanwhile, Saudi Arabia and Iraq are to launch a joint trade commission, the Saudi cabinet announced yesterday, in a sign of a thaw in ties between the two neighbors. "The cabinet has decided to approve the establishment of the Saudi-Iraqi Coordinating Commission and to delegate the Saudi minister of trade and investments to sign on behalf of the kingdom," read a statement carried by state-run SPA news agency.— Agencies

180 bodies had been received so far at his facility alone, many of them children, leaving no space to lay what he described as the "overwhelming number of dead". Many more bodies were taken to private morgues, Sinneh said.

Images obtained by AFP showed a ferocious churning of dark orange mud coursing down a steep street in the capital, while videos posted by local residents showed people waist and chest deep in water trying to traverse the road. Fatmata Sesay, who lives on the hilltop area of Juba, said she, her three children and husband were awoken at 4:30 am by rain beating down on the mud house they occupy, which was by then submerged by water. She managed to escape by climbing onto the roof. "We have lost everything and we do not have a place to sleep," she told AFP.

Local media reports said a section of a hill in the Regent area of the city had partially collapsed, exacerbating the disaster. Other images showed battered corpses piled on top of each other, as residents struggled to cope with the destruction. Meanwhile disaster management official Candy Rogers said that "over 2,000 people are homeless," hinting at the huge humanitarian effort that will be required to deal with the fallout of the flooding in one of Africa's poorest nations.

Separately, at least 175 people have died and thousands have fled their homes as monsoon floods swept across Nepal, India and Bangladesh, officials said yesterday, warning the toll could rise as the extent of the damage becomes clear. Three days of relentless downpours sparked flash floods and

landslides that have killed at least 80 people in Nepal, 73 across northern and eastern India and 22 in Bangladesh.

Around 200,000 people are living in emergency camps in Assam in northeast India, which suffers frequent flooding during the annual monsoon rains. Another 15,000 have had to leave their homes in the eastern state of Bihar, which borders Nepal and where one official said seven rivers were at danger levels. Large parts of the state were submerged in 2008 when a river burst its banks across the border in Nepal, with the two countries trading blame for the disaster.

All trains to the northeast have been suspended until tomorrow, with sections of the track completely submerged in water, Indian railway spokesman Anil Saxena told AFP. In Nepal, ariel photos taken by an AFP photographer showed huge swathes of land in the southeast still underwater yesterday afternoon.

Police said over 48,000 homes have been totally submerged by the floods across Nepal's southern planes. As emergency workers struggled to reach far-flung areas, the country's home ministry said another 36 people were missing, presumed dead, revising down an earlier count after more bodies were found.

The Nepal Red Cross warned that shortages of safe drinking water and food could create a humanitarian crisis in the impoverished Himalayan country. "In many parts of the country there is a scarcity of safe drinking water creating a high risk of health hazards," spokesman Dibya Raj Poudel told AFP. "Several villages and settlements are unreachable. Telecommunications, mobile phones are still not working so it is difficult to give a full assessment." — AFP

Trump said anyone who engaged in criminal behavior over the weekend in Virginia will be held accountable. 'Justice will be delivered," the president said in his address.

"I wish that he would have said those same words on Saturday," responded Democratic Senator Mark Warner of Virginia on MSNBC. "I'm disappointed it took him a couple of days." Activist Al Sharpton echoed that. "It took 48 hours ... It was clearly a statement based on the pressure that he had been given over the weekend," he said on MSNBC.

Earlier yesterday, in a strong rebuke to Trump, the chief executive of one of the world's largest pharmaceutical companies, Merck & Co Inc, resigned from a business panel led by the president, citing a need for leadership countering bigotry. CEO Kenneth Frazier, who is black, did not name Trump in his statement, but the rebuke was implicit. "America's leaders must honor our fundamental values by

clearly rejecting expressions of hatred, bigotry and group supremacy," said Frazier.

Trump lashed out almost immediately following the resignation, saying on Twitter now that "Ken Frazier of Merck Pharma has resigned from President's Manufacturing Council, he will have more time to LOWER RIPOFF DRUG PRICES!"The son of a janitor, Frazier joined Merck as general counsel of one of the drugmaker's subsidiaries in 1992, working his way up to CEO of the company in 2011.

Unfortunately, even two years after the announcement of the new system, not even a single nurse has been recruited to Kuwait through the eMigrate system." an Indian Embassy official told Kuwait Times yesterday. Although the Ministry of Health (MoH) and the Indian Embassy in Kuwait reached an initial agreement on the proposal in 2015, MoH has shown reluctance to pursue the new system as it believes the system lacks the necessary transparency. A top MoH delegation led by Dr Jamal Harbi, currently the health minister, visited India last year to follow up the matter.

However, certain alleged reports of violations such as parallel recruitments by government agencies themselves have created a major stumbling block to the initiative. At the same time, recruitments to Kuwait are still going on reportedly via Dubai, circumventing the eMigrate system and thwarting all official efforts to put an end to illegal recruitments.

The Indian embassy official informed that the Joint Working Group (JWG) of Kuwait and India has been scheduled to meet from Sept 18-20 and will discuss the matter. The Indian delegation headed by Minister of State for External Affairs M J Akbar will arrive in Kuwait to attend the JWG meeting, he added.

"And we're hoping to get manufacturers to come up with some new products. Potentially there could be a huge market for cool pavement products, and in fact, it's part of a much larger economic trend where solutions for climate change could be the next great investments for the future," Spotts added. The city will also monitor how Angelenos react to the newfangled asphalt - and how quickly the notoriously thick LA traffic dirties the gray coating.

George Ban-Weiss, an assistant professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the University of Southern California, said cool pavements show promise in reducing heat, but "may have some environmental penalties". "Recent and current research is working out whether the environmental benefits of cool pavements outweigh those penalties," Ban-Weiss told AFP. Still, "the city of Los Angeles is taking the right approach and installing and assessing several cool pavement test sections before committing to widespread adoption," he said.

Ban-Weiss noted that heat mitigation strategies like planting trees along streets and using cool roofing materials were more "no-brainer" remedies. Alan Barreca, an environmental science professor at the University of California, Los Angeles, said the pavement cooling technology could be more equitable than current methods like air conditioning. "Not everyone has the resources to use air conditioning, so there's concern that some low-income families will suffer," he said. "That bothers me on a moral dimension. The pavement would provide benefits to everyone. It can protect people who have to be outdoors," he said. Plus, he added, "lower temperatures - due to the pavement - mean less reliance on air conditioning. So, that means less greenhouse gases." — AFP

Two Kuwaitis among 18 killed in Burkina...

"They started shooting on the terrace. We climbed up the stairs and lay on the ground. The attackers came and pointed their guns at us," said one survivor, interviewed in hospital on national television. "I didn't understand their language, it might have been Arabic." A surgeon said the local hospital was "overwhelmed".

The restaurant is just 200 m from a hotel and cafe targeted in an assault in January 2016 that left 30 people dead and 71 wounded, many of them foreigners. That attack was claimed by Al-Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb (AQIM). A government statement described the latest deadly shooting as a "terrorist attack", while President Roch Marc Christian Kabore condemned it as "a despicable attack that has Ouagadougou in mourning". "The fight against terrorism is a long-term struggle," he said on Twitter.

A police officer who spoke to AFP on condition of anonymity cited witnesses as saying at least two assailants arrived on a motorcycle around 9:00 pm (2100 GMT) armed with Kalashnikovs, and opened fire. A waiter also said he saw "three men arrive on a 4X4 vehicle around 9:30 pm, get off the vehicle and open fire on customers seated on the terrace".

The shooting is the latest in the region targeting spots popular with foreigners and locals alike. Last year's attack on the Splendid hotel and Cappuccino restaurant, down the road from the Aziz Istanbul, came weeks after jihadists claimed an assault on a hotel in the capital of neighboring Mali that killed 20 people. And in March last year 14 civilians and two special forces sol-

diers were killed when gunmen stormed the Ivory Coast beach resort of Grand-Bassam, an attack also claimed by AQIM. In Burkina Faso, a dozen soldiers were killed in December in an assault on their northern base, and in October there was an attack that killed four troops and two civilians. An Australian and a Romanian, abducted in Burkina Faso in 2015, are still being held hostage by Qaeda-affiliated Islamists.

Sean Smith, senior Africa analyst at risk consultancy Verisk Maplecroft, said the restaurant attack "illustrates that the threat of terrorism now looms over most of the Sahel region". "While most attacks in Burkina Faso remain confined to the remote northern regions that border Mali, this incident reiterates that Islamists also have the ability to strike at will in the capital."

French President Emmanuel Macron spoke with Kabore, his office said, condemning the "terrorist attack" in the former French colony and stressing the "urgent need" to speed up the launch of a five-country anti-jihadist force in the Sahel. France has its own Barkhane anti-jihadist operation in the region and has been pushing efforts to set up the 5,000-member force, manned by Chad, Niger, Mali, Burkina Faso and Mauritania, by October.

African Union chief Alpha Conde said the attack "shows the importance of bringing the force into operation" and called on the European Union to find the estimated 400 million euros (\$471 million) of extra funding needed. "We must accelerate the G5 launch so that Africans are on the frontline in defending the security of their citizens and that of expatriates," he told France 24 television. — AFP

FROOME SPEARHEADS SKY'S ASSAULT ON VUELTA

LONDON: Four-time Tour de France champion Chris Froome said he had "unfinished business" with the Vuelta a Espana after Team Sky unveiled their line-up for this year's race yesterday. Froome, 32, hopes to emulate Jacques Anquetil (1963) and Bernard Hinault (1978) by becoming only the third rider to win the Tour and the Vuelta in the same year. A three-time Vuelta run-

ner-up, Froome will be boosted by the presence of key climber Wout Poels, who returns after missing the Tour due to a knee injury. "It certainly feels as if I've got unfinished business with this race," Froome said in a Sky press release. "I've finished second three times now, but I've got a good feeling about this year's Vuelta. "It feels like we're on much more of a mission this year and aiming for the Tour/Vuelta double this season has been a huge motivation. "I don't think we've been to the Vuelta a Espana with a team as strong as we've got this year." —AFP

WESTERN FORCE OPEN LEGAL FIGHT AGAINST SUPER AXE

SYDNEY: Western Force opened their legal fight to remain a Super Rugby team yesterday as they requested an appeal against the decision to axe them and won an injunction against the Australian Rugby Union. The Perth club's parent body, Rugby WA, lodged the appeal request with the New South Wales Supreme Court, after the ARU announced their removal from the southern hemisphere competition last week. Western Force have fallen victim to Australia's decision to cut one of its five Super Rugby teams as the unwieldy, globe-trotting competition slims down from 18 sides to 15 next year. They expect to find out by August 21 if they are able to appeal. The injunction, granted yesterday, means the ARU cannot sack or relocate any of Force's players until the issue is resolved. Rugby WA enjoys the heavyweight backing of billionaire mining magnate Andrew Forrest, who has called for a complete overhaul of the ARU board. —AFP

BARCELONA BEGIN SPENDING SPREE WITH PAULINHO

BARCELONA: Barcelona made Brazilian international midfielder Paulinho their first signing since banking a world record fee for Neymar yesterday after agreeing a 40 million euro (\$47 million) fee with Chinese club Guangzhou Evergrande. "Barcelona and Guangzhou Evergrande have reached an agreement for the transfer of the player Paulinho Bezerra for 40 million euros," Barca said in a statement. The 29-year-old has signed a four-year deal with a 120 million euro buyout clause and will be formally presented on Thursday. The announcement of Barca's third signing of the summer transfer window after Gerard Deulofeu and Nelson Semedo came just hours after the Catalans suffered a 3-1 home defeat to Real Madrid in the Spanish Super Cup first leg on Sunday. After the game, midfielder Sergio Busquets put pressure on the Barca board by claiming Barca had to strengthen their squad before the transfer window closes on August 31. — AFP

SEAHAWKS' BENNETT PLANS TO CONTINUE ANTHEM PROTEST

CARSON: Seattle Seahawks defensive end Michael Bennett said Sunday he will sit during the national anthem this season to protest social injustice and segregation. Bennett sat on the visiting bench during "The Star-Spangled Banner" before the Seahawks' preseason opener against the Los Angeles Rams, a decision he made prior to protests by white supremacists at the University of Virginia over the weekend. But what happened in Charlottesville, Virginia, including the death of a young woman when she was struck by a car deliberately driven into a group of counter-protesters on Saturday, solidified Bennett's decision.

"With everything that's been going on the last couple of months and especially after the last couple of days, seeing everything in Virginia, seeing what's going on out there earlier today in Seattle, I just wanted to be able to use my platform to be able to continue to speak over injustice," Bennett said.

"First of all, I want people to understand I love the military. My father was in the military. I love hot dogs like any other American. I love football like any other American, but I don't love segregation. I don't love riots. I don't love oppression. I don't love gender slander. I just want to see people have the equality that they deserve, and I want to be able to use this platform to continuously push the message of that, you know, and keep journeying out and keep finding out how unselfish can we be as a society."

Bennett was at least the third prominent NFL player to protest during the anthem in the first full week of preseason games. Oakland Raiders running back Marshawn Lynch, a former teammate of Bennett's in Seattle, also sat during the anthem. Los Angeles Rams defensive end Robert Quinn raised his right fist, continuing his approach from last season following then-San Francisco 49ers quarterback Colin Kaepernick's decision to kneel during the anthem. Kaepernick is a free agent, and the controversy over his decision to protest the anthem and the form he used has not quelled, even as he remains unsigned. Bennett said he is willing to deal with similar fallout.

"Of course I'm going to face backlash," Bennett said. "This is bigger than me. This is bigger than football. This is bigger than anything that we have. This is about people. This is about bringing opportunities to people, giving people equality. This is bigger than a sport."

Bennett said he had spoken to several other NFL players about possible protests, but had not talked with Lynch yet. While he acknowledged the possibility of more widespread and formally organized protests happening later, Bennett wanted to express himself.

"I think everybody has a time where they feel like they need to be who they are and stand up for what they believe in," Bennett said.—AP

Detroit closed out its scoring with a 15-yard TD pass from Brad Kaaya to Dontez Ford.

With Luck still on the physically unable to perform list following offseason surgery on a partially torn labrum in his throwing shoulder,

the Colts sputtered.

Indy finished with 230 total yards - 90 on its final drive - and 14 first downs. Their only points came from Adam Vinatieri's 42-yard field goal in the first half and a 1-yard TD plunge from Troymaine Pope as time ran out.

A red flag for oil on the track only added to the drama, and when the race restarted for the final time, Larson who hadn't led at all to that point - drove to the right of Jones and passed to the inside of Truex.

"We got beat fair and square," said Truex, the series points leader. "The double-file restarts are tricky, and sometimes you do them right, sometimes you screw them up, and unfortunately I screwed the one up that mattered the most today."

Larson has won the last three Cup races at MIS, the first driver to do that since Bill Elliott, who won four straight from 1985-86. This was Larson's third win of the season and ended a mini-slump in which he had finished out of the top 20 in three straight races.

Truex and Jones finished second and third for Furniture Row Racing. Larson won by 0.31 seconds in his No. 42 Chevrolet. Brad Keselowski and Truex won the first two stages. There was a lot of hoopla Friday when Ganassi announced he was letting Larson go to Iowa. Both driver and owner were going to be in the spotlight no matter what happened in Sunday's race.

"When you're in my position of this past week's activities with all the talk about Knoxville and going to Knoxville last night and not getting back here until two in the morning, I'm out on the end of the diving board there a lot of times," Ganassi said. "So I appreciate when Kyle steps up and does what he did today. It makes it all worthwhile, obviously."

Keselowski, the pole winner, led for 105 laps, but finished 17th. He is now winless in 17 Cup races at his home state's track. Dale Earnhardt Jr., who has two wins at Michigan, finished 14th in his final race at MIS before he retires at the end of this season. The race was originally scheduled for 200 laps and 400 miles. It ended up being 202 laps. Keselowski led almost the entire way through the 60-lap first stage, only giving up the top spot briefly during a pit cycle. Keselowski was second to Truex in the second stage.

Aside from the end of the first two stages, there were no yellow flags until lap 140, after Kasey Kahne slid in front of Daniel Suarez and slammed into the wall, taking them both out.

TOYOTA'S DAY

Keselowski ended Toyota's streak of five straight poles and offered a theory as to why after qualifying Friday. "About this time

every year NASCAR takes all the cars to kind of check to make sure that the competitive balance is where they want it to be," Keselowski said then. "We had a strong suspicion that those guys would kind of tune it down this weekend, so not to post a pretty big number in inspection that maybe balanced back out the competition."

On race day, Truex and Jones finished second and third in their Toyotas, but the win went to a Chevy. Keselowski drives a Ford. "I think that for Brad and those guys that think that maybe we're sandbagging, I think it's a glimpse of, if they get their stuff right, maybe they can beat us," Truex said. "It's not all just that we have better race cars. ... I feel good about our race cars and what we've been doing all year. We brought some new stuff here this weekend to try to get better, and that's what we'll continue to do."—AFP

RUNNER-UPS MOLINARI, REED MAKE MAJOR BREAKTHROUGHS

CHARLOTTE: Italy's Francesco Molinari and American Patrick Reed achieved their best major finishes Sunday by sharing second place at the PGA Championship, although it was bittersweet not bringing home the title. Reed and Molinari each fired fourunder par 67s in the final round at Quail Hollow to join South Africa's Louis Oosthuizen, the 2010 British Open champion, in second on six-under 278, two strokes behind US winner Justin Thomas.

Molinari, 34, and Reed, 27, were both five strokes off the pace after 54 holes but battled from behind before late birdies blunted their charge.

"Just one of those where I got myself too far behind and just couldn't claw back enough," Reed said. "I could claw back to get a finish but not where I wanted to be."

World number 21 Molinari's best prior showing in 33 major starts was a share of ninth at the 2013 British Open. But to be in a five-way share of the lead with three holes to play after following a secondround 64 with a 74 was a career highlight.

"It was great," Molinari said. "Yesterday I had a really bad start and it was pretty hard to recover from that. So that adds to the satisfaction after today.

"It would have been nice to start the day maybe a couple of shots closer to the leaders, but it was great getting to the last three holes tied for the lead. It's what you practice for and what you train for. Hopefully I'll get more soon."

Reed, ranked 28th, managed his first major top-10 showing and said he was shocked that contending in a major felt no different than a regular event.

"It felt good getting myself in position. I was surprised that it didn't feel any different than a normal tournament," Reed said. "I was just out there trying to make as many birdies as possible. I felt like I went out there, I made enough birdies, but I had didn't feel any pressure."— AFF

And at age 24, he couldn't think of a better time. Youth is taking over the highest level of golf, and there were times Thomas felt left behind.

Rory McIlroy already had four majors when he was 25. Closer to home was Jordan Spieth, a close friend since they were 14. Spieth won his third major at the British Open last month to give him three legs of the career Grand Slam.

"Frustration probably isn't the right word," Thomas said. "Jealously definitely is. I wanted to be doing that, and I wasn't." Sunday at Quail Hollow was his moment. Starting the final round two shots out of the lead, Thomas closed with a 3-under 68 for a two-shot victory to capture the final major of the year. It required a little bit of good fortune, like when his tee shot bounced out of a tree and into the fairway on the par-5 10th hole, which ended with his 8-foot putt teetering on the edge of the cup for 12 seconds before gravity finally took over

and the ball dropped for birdie. "I didn't even see it go in," said Thomas, who had his back turned to the cup as he was asking caddie Jimmy Johnson how it didn't go in. Players are allowed reasonable time to get to the ball, and then they get 10 seconds before they hit the next shot, so he was well within the limit.

He seized control on the back nine with a chipin for birdie from 40 feet on the par-3 13th hole. Above all, it required plenty of grit, and Thomas showed plenty of that. The key moment in his victory came along the infamous "Green Mile" at Quail Hollow, a brutal stretch of holes where players are trying to hang on with pars. Thomas had a oneshot lead over Hideki Matsuyama when he drove into the rough, and his approach tumbled into a bunker. He did well to get that out to 6 feet.

Matsuyama was spared by the thick rough behind the green that kept his ball from going into the water, and he had a good lie that allowed him to chip to 5 feet. Thomas wasted no time over the putt and drilled into the center of the cup. Matsuyama missed and fell two shots behind.

And then Thomas effectively ended it with a 7iron so pure that he let the club swirl through his hand as the ball soared over the water, onto the green and rolled out to 15 feet on the 221-yard shot to a peninsula green. His birdie putt swirled into the cup, and the rest was easy. He finished with a bogey - his first since the

third hole - when it no longer mattered. Thomas finished at 8-under 276. He won by two shots over Francesco Molinari (67), Patrick Reed (67) and Louis Oosthuizen (70), none of whom were a serious threat as they played the 18th.

His real challenge was Matsuyama playing next to him, and Kevin Kisner, the 54-hole leader in the group behind him. Kisner ran off two important birdies on the 14th and 15th holes to get within one shot, but the final stretch is no place to make up more ground. He three-putted from 100 feet on the 16th hole to fall two back, couldn't convert from long range on the 17th and hit into the water because of mud on his ball on the 18th.

Among those waiting for Thomas alongside the 18th green were his father and Spieth. Mike Thomas, the longtime pro at Harmony Landing outside Louisville, Kentucky, spread his arms wide as he approached his only son and wrapped them

Ever since his son was in elementary school, he has been collecting golf balls from his victory. The total is now 131. Asked if he made sure to get the ball Thomas used to tap in the final putt, Mike Thomas reached into his pocket, smiled and said, "You mean this one?" The PGA Championship was young elite in the game, and it was important to his family. His grandfather, Paul Thomas, also was a club pro and has been a PGA of America member

for 60 years. He was the first person Thomas called. "As a kid growing up, you want to win all the majors. You want to win any major," Thomas said after his two-shot victory. — AP

BARRETT WARNS WALLABIES **OVER RUSHING TACTICS**

SYDNEY: Beauden Barrett warned the Wallabies yesterday that the All Blacks are ready to counter any plans of rush defence in this week's Rugby Championship opener in Sydney.

The All Blacks fly-half ace said the world champions have worked on countering the defensive tactic after encountering problems with the British and Irish Lions in their drawn series in New Zealand last month.

Wallabies' coach Michael Cheika says he intends to follow the Lions' lead and put the All Blacks under pressure to conjure a huge upset in Saturday's Bledisloe Cup Test.

But Barrett warned that rush defence comes with a risk and the Wallabies could leave gaps to be exploited if not consistently accurate, allowing their bid to lift the Bledisloe Cup for the first time since 2002 to unravel at the first hurdle.

"We do understand (rush defence) puts the person with the ball under a bit more pressure but there are opportunities elsewhere," Barrett told reporters. "More teams are starting to bring that line speed. If the Wallabies do bring that on Saturday, we've learned ways to deal with that."

The 2016 World Player of the Year admitted that the All Blacks found "a lot to work on" in their review of the intense Lions series, when uncharacteristic errors cost them.

"We were perhaps tested in areas where we haven't been before, so that's exactly what we wanted," he said. "We ask those hard questions of ourselves and of our team-mates, and it gets the best out of the team. It is just what we needed."

New Zealand will be boosted by the return of vice-captain Ben Smith, who missed the second and third Tests against the Lions because of a form of vertigo. Sonny Bill Williams, who was sent off in the second Lions Test, will be back to reinforce the All Blacks in Sydney.

Williams received a four-week ban after being sent off for a dangerous charge into the head of British and Irish Lions wing Anthony Watson in Wellington last month.

An independent appeal panel ruled that New Zealand's game against Counties Manukau and Taranaki on August 11, when they will play 40 minutes against each team, constitutes an official match and counts towards his ban. World Rugby expressed disappointment with the appeals panel's decision and said there was need for greater clarity over the definition of a match. "He's as positive as ever," Barrett said of Williams. "Even throughout the Lions series we saw that of Sonny, he got over it pretty quickly." — AFP

'SUPERHUMAN' WANTED — BOLT EXIT LEAVES VACUUM TO FILL

BOLT: Usain Bolt's retirement leaves a Committee (IOC) is widely credited with huge vacuum to fill but athletics is moving in the right direction in rebranding itself after scandals that seriously damaged its image, according to sports marketing experts.

At one point, following serious allegations about former athletics boss Lamine Diack as well as the Russian doping scandal, the sport resembled the Jamaican superstar in his last appearance in a championship final, Saturday's 4x100 metres relay, lying prone down and out on the track.

However, under the leadership of Diack's successor Sebastian Coe, president of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), the governing body say it is beginning to take the right steps in restoring its image.

"The authorities are making it more accessible and improving its presentation and taking it into an urban environment with street races," Jon Tibbs, chairman of leading sport public relations firm Jon Tibbs Associates (JTA), told AFP.

"It is becoming more accessible and more cool but then it has to take into account that it is competing with sports such as parkour."

Michael Payne, who as director of marketing at the International Olympic

transforming both its brand and finances through sponsorship, told AFP that Coe has taken measures which has seen the sport "turn a corner" but from a "very low base". "There is an awful lot to do post the Diack era," said Payne speaking by phone from Switzerland.

"The issues facing athletics go far beyond losing a superstar of Bolt's stature. With no disrespect intended, superstars come and they go."

Payne, who after leaving the IOC in 2004 performed a similar role with Formula One, said Coe had brought much needed dynamism on the back of his leading the winning bid for the 2012 Olympics and then staying on to deliver a successful London Games.

'They (the sport) have to ensure they are in robust health and clearly they were allowed to drift significantly off track," said Payne.

"Coe has been instigating a drastic restructuring at grassroots level but you also need great events and London (the world championships) seen from afar has been a huge success. So they are still capable of delivering a great championships. "Bolt has shown he is willing to act as an ambassador and he can play an important role in bringing the sport back to a pre-eminent position."

Tibbs, who has been honoured by Queen Elizabeth II for his services to international trade and sports, says the sport does need to find a "superhuman" replacement. He equates the loss of Bolt to how golf has suffered since Tiger Woods went into meltdown.

"Golf has declined in many markets since Woods was in his pomp, although it is not in terminal decline. "Jordan Spieth is a great player but not a lot of people would be racing to jump out of bed and say I want to be the next Jordan Spieth. "Woods and Bolt had exactly the same unbeatable aura, broke records and had a maverick edge to them. They were true rock stars.

"Rory McIlroy has the maverick edge but is simply not winning enough to warrant being in the same camp."

Payne, who says the awarding of medals several years after the event is not good for the "image of the sport" as it undermines spectators' confidence that what they are watching in London is fair competition, believes one area the sport should address is modernising the way it presents itself.

"One of the challenges the sport is facing in 2017 is athletics shown on television isn't as conducive to what it was

30 years ago. "I am not sure athletics has moved with the times to a new media environment."

Tibbs, whose company played a leading role in Sochi winning the 2014 Winter Olympics amongst other successes, says the sport is moving forwards after some very rough times.

"I would give them, for the moment, the benefit of the doubt that things are moving in the right direction.

"However, it is up to Coe, WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency), athletes entourages and event organisers to get together and enforce change. "That is the challenge facing Coe." —AFP

RED SOX ROOKIES DEVERS, BENINTENDI LEAD WIN

NEW YORK: Rafael Devers hit a stunning homer off Aroldis Chapman to tie the game in the ninth inning, and fellow Red Sox rookie Andrew Benintendi singled home the go-ahead run in the 10th as Boston beat the New York Yankees 3-2 on Sunday night. Chris Sale struck out 12 in his latest dominant performance, but Boston trailed 2-1 before the 20-year-old Devers connected on a 103 mph fastball and became the second lefthanded hitter to homer off Chapman (4-2) in his eight-year career. By winning a battle of hardthrowing bullpens, the Red Sox upped their AL East lead to a season-high 5 1/2 games over rival New York. Boston (67-50) took two of three in the series and is a season-best 17 games over .500 after winning 10 of its past 11. Boston closer Craig Kimbrel (4-0) struck out Brett Gardner with a runner on third to end the ninth and then tossed a perfect 10th.

MARLINS 5, ROCKIES 3

Giancarlo Stanton homered for the fourth straight game, hitting his 42nd of the year to tie the Marlins' season record, and Miami completed its first series sweep of Colorado since 2006. Stanton homered leading off the third inning to match Gary Sheffield's team record set in 1996. It was the 250th homer of Stanton's career. Rockies All-Star third baseman Nolan Arenado, the major league RBI leader, left in the fifth inning after being hit on the left hand by an 88 mph fastball thrown by Vance Worley. German Marquez (9-5) lost for the first time in seven starts, allowing five runs in 4 1/3 innings. Javy Guerra (1-0) earned his first victory since 2014 with two scoreless innings, and Odrisamer Despaigne pitched a perfect ninth for his first big league save.

DODGERS 6, PADRES 4

Justin Turner hit two home runs, Yasmani Grandal also went deep and Los Angeles won for the 28th time in 33 games, improving the best record in the majors to 83-34. The Dodgers are 16-0-3 in their last 19 series, and haven't lost one since June 5-7 to Washington. Cory Spangenberg hit two home runs for the Padres. Kenta Maeda (11-4) went 5 1/3 innings, giving up three earned runs and four hits and striking out eight. Kenley Jansen retired the Padres in order in the ninth for his 32nd save. Luis Perdomo (6-7) was the loser.

Jake Arrieta (12-8) won consecutive starts for the first time since early April, Javier Baez and Ian Happ hit consecutive home runs in the eighth inning and Chicago reopened a one-game lead over St. Louis in the NL Central. Kris Bryant put the Cubs ahead when he scored from second on a wild pitch from Zack Godley (5-5) in the first inning on strike three to Victor Caratini. The reigning NL MVP added his 21st home run of the season in the ninth inning, reaching base for the 13th time in 15 plate appearances during the three-game series. KLOPP, LIVERPOOL BACK IN GERMANY IN CHAMPIONS LEAGUE PLAY-OFFS

PARIS: Jurgen Klopp takes his Liverpool side to his native Germany this week to face Hoffenheim as they target a return to the group stage of the Champions League. It is three years since the Anfield outfit, five times European champions, last graced the group stage of the continent's elite club competition.

A fourth-place finish in the Premier League last season exposed them to a complicated draw in the play-offs and a pairing with the Bundesliga outfit means a trip to the Rhein Neckar Arena in the first leg on Tuesday. Klopp has been to his home country with Liverpool before,

overseeing victories against Augsburg and old club Borussia Dortmund en route to the Europa League final two seasons ago.

They were also in Germany during pre-season, beating both Hertha Berlin and Bayern Munich. The Reds, who began their Premier League campaign with a 3-3 draw at Watford on Saturday, are without Adam Lallana and Nathaniel Clyne at the moment but Roberto Firmino is fit. The Brazilian is set to face the club for whom he starred for four years before being sold to Liverpool in 2015. Hoffenheim, from a village of just over 3,000 souls in southwestern Germany, finished fourth in the Bundesliga last season to qualify for Europe for the first time. The match against Liverpool comes four days before they face Werder Bremen in the first match of their 10th Bundesliga campaign.

"We'll do everything in our power to get through. Liverpool are a phenomenal side, but I already have an idea how we can snatch a result," their coach Julian Nagelsmann, just 30, said after the draw.

Hoffenheim have been weakened since last season, losing German international duo Sebastian Rudy and Niklas Suele to Bayern Munich.

STRIKER WOES FOR CELTIC

Brendan Rodgers was the last manager to lead Liverpool into the Champions League. The Northern Irishman is currently hoping to take Scottish champions Celtic into the group stage for the second season running.

The Glasgow giants have beaten Linfield and Rosenborg to make it to a play-off against Astana of Kazakhstan, who visit Celtic Park for the first leg tomorrow. Celtic beat Astana 3-2 on aggregate in the third qualifying round last season with Leigh Griffiths scoring

twice in the tie and Moussa Dembele's late penalty in the second leg taking them through.

But Dembele misses this tie with a knee injury and Griffiths has been struggling too, giving Rodgers a headache with Celtic needing a good result before the near 4,000-mile trip to Kazakhstan for the return.

"It's going to be a tough game for us," Rodgers told The Scotsman. "The first game is important. At home, the atmosphere has been absolutely incredible in the Champions League games in particular so we'll need that tomorrow night."—AFP

LAZIO BEAT JUVENTUS 3-2 TO WIN SUPER CUP AFTER WILD FINALE

ROME: Alessandro Murgia scored a lastgasp winner as Lazio beat Juventus 3-2 Sunday to win the Italian Super Cup after a wild end to the match. Two goals from Ciro Immobile, including an opening penalty, had seemingly set Lazio on the way to a comfortable win. But Paulo Dybala netted a stunning free kick in the 85th minute and converted a penalty in the first minute of stoppage time.

The match appeared to be heading for extra time before youth academy graduate Murgia, who had come on as an 80thminute substitute, scored the winner. "I'm happy, and very emotional," said Murgia, who turned 21 on Wednesday. "It was hard because they levelled at the end, but we never give up. We believed right until the end and we are really happy.

"We are a united squad, we are a group, and that's how you get victories." The result goes some way to avenging Lazio's defeat to Juventus in the Italian Cup final in May.

"Credit to the lads for what they did and deserved," Lazio coach Simone Inzaghi said. "We wanted revenge after the Italian Cup defeat and we had a perfect game ... everyone gave everything."

Juventus starts its search for a seventh straight Serie A title at home to Cagliari on Saturday, the day before Lazio hosts newly promoted Spal. "Lazio deserved the win, because they played better, they fought much more," Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri said. "Apart from the final 30 minutes, we practically didn't play and that should make us think, that should bring us back to earth.

"There are no excuses, I hate losing and especially losing like this ... It was really an ugly performance and we lost the first objective of the season. The league starts on Saturday and we need to start winning." The Italian Super Cup normally pits the league champion against the cup winner, but Juventus had again won the double

last season - for the third successive year.

Shortly after that success, Juventus lost a second Champions League final in three seasons, while reports of infighting and the departure of key defender Leonardo Bonucci to Serie A rival AC Milan has made it a difficult offseason for the Italian champion. Juventus was looking to get back on track in Rome, and started strongly in the traditional curtain-raiser. Lazio goalkeeper Thomas Strakosha pulled off a great save to keep out Juan Cuadrado's effort from close range and denied Gonzalo Higuain moments later in a frantic opening five

Lazio withstood the pressure and slowly took control of the match before going in front shortly after the half-hour mark. Immobile was brought down by Juventus goalkeeper Gianluigi Buffon and he dusted himself down to fire the resulting penalty into the bottom right corner.

Lazio almost doubled its lead minutes later but Buffon pulled off a double save to deny first Dusan Basta and then Lucas Leiva. Lazio did extend its advantage nine minutes into the second half when Marco Parolo whipped in a cross and Immobile sent a looping header into the far corner.

Allegri immediately reacted, bringing on new signings Douglas Costa and Mattia De Sciglio and he later also introduced Federico Bernardeschi.

That had an effect and Dybala got Juventus back into the match when he curled a free kick into the left side of the goal. Juventus was then given the chance to level when it was awarded a penalty after Adam Marusic tripped Alex Sandro.

Dybala had missed the decisive penalty in the shootout in last year's Super Cup defeat to Milan but he stepped up and converted. Another twist was still to come. Three minutes later, Jordan Lukaku went on a winding run before pulling back from the byline for Murgia to smash in the winner. —AP

NEYMAR SHINES ON DEBUT, SAYS HE'S 'MORE ALIVE THAN EVER'

GUINGAMP: Declaring he was "more alive than ever," Neymar did not disappoint on his debut for Paris Saint-Germain. The world's most expensive player provided a pulsating evening's entertainment at the Stade du Roudourou on Sunday, with one goal and an assist, as PSG overcame strong resistance from Guingamp to win 3-0 in the French league.

Neymar was named man of the match, and it was deserved. "I'm very happy with the trophy, but the most important (thing) was to win, Neymar said through a translator. "I knew it would be difficult to leave Barca, but I'm very happy to be here. People believe that leaving Barca is like to die. But I'm more alive than ever. I'm very happy, and the football is the same."

Neymar, who signed from Barcelona last week, missed the start of the season at the Parc des Princes against Amiens due to paperwork problems. Hired for a world-record 222 million euros (\$262 million), he started on the left wing of PSG's attack in the small Brittany town.

Neymar looked intensely focused from the start, easily switching from one wing to the other, and often taking a playmaker role. Pre-match festivities in the small Brittany town included some fireworks, but Neymar was jeered by a handful of fans as he came on the pitch to warm up with his teammates, pointing a finger toward the sky. By the end, many local fans gave him a standing ovation.

Neymar's first touch in the French league was a long ball for Angel Di Maria that landed on the edge of the box, but the Argentine player could not latch onto it. Nevmar's vision, acceleration and through balls in a weaker league than Spain's unsettled Guingamp's back four, and his trademark dribbles were also on display at the Roudourou. Midfielder Lucas Deaux will be remembered as the first French league player to be nutmegged by the former Barcelona star.

Encouragingly for PSG, Neymar has already gelled with Cavani, with both players finding each other instinctively despite the lack of space in the Guingamp box. The big question that immediately emerged when Neymar signed with PSG was how he could fit into coach Unai Emery's system. Neymar proved he can play well with the Uruguay forward, especially if Emery continues to use Cavani in a central position.

"I knew he was a top player," Neymar said about Cavani. "Now I'm playing with him. He is a great player, and when you have such great players in a team, it's easy." Neymar completed 103 passes, one of which set up Cavani in the 62nd minute, as his teammate scored his 90th goal in 135 topflight matches. Cavani then turned provider to set up Neymar with a cutback pass that the Brazil captain converted from close range with a poke in the 82nd minute.

"I was more impressed by Cavani, who scored again," said Guingamp veteran striker Jimmy Briand. "Neymar, there is no need to introduce him anymore. We knew he was going to be a big threat.

On a sleepy summer Sunday, the atmosphere slowly built in the small town of Guingamp, though most of the streets were still empty midafternoon. Fans later gathered for pre-match drinks at a downtown bar, "Le panier a salade (The salad shaker)," where walls are adorned with autographed jerseys from Guingamp players. Some PSG fans mingled with home supporters in a friendly atmosphere. "It's magic to see Neymar at the Roudourou stadium," said Florian Nicolas, a 30-year-old PSG fan who settled in Brittany five years ago. "This match will be watched worldwide."

A town of 7,000 inhabitants known for its local galette-Saucisse treat -a sausage rolled in a crepe - Guingamp is also football-crazy and has

witnessed the emergence of world-class players including the likes of Didier Drogba and Florent Malouda in the early 2000s. A club-record 18,378 fans watched Sunday's game. — AP

SPECTRE OF 2015 LOOMS AFTER CHELSEA FALSE START

LONDON: For Chelsea's supporters, Saturday's calamitous 3-2 loss at home to Burnley will have immediately rekindled uncomfortable memories of their last Premier League title defence. In 2015, Chelsea lost nine of their opening 16 games, costing manager Jose Mourinho his job, and eventually drifted to a

The new campaign is only one game old, but the dismal nature of their defeat, in which Gary Cahill and Cesc Fabregas were sent off, allied to the club's transfer struggles mean alarm bells are already ringing.

"There's a lot of negativity about the club because of the lack of signings that they've been able to bring in," said Alan Shearer, the former England striker turned BBC pundit. "And it was a real concern, what happened in the first half.

"Whether you agree with the sending off (of Cahill) or not, they behaved like the Chelsea of two years ago under Mourinho and basically threw in the towel." Cahill and Fabregas will both miss Sunday's away game against new Wembley tenants Tottenham Hotspur, who finished second to Chelsea last season and will be out to avenge their 4-2 FA Cup semi-final defeat a few months ago.

Chelsea manager Antonio Conte will also be without Eden Hazard and new signing Tiemoue Bakayoko due to injury and those are just the start of his problems. Having made only four new signings and allowed a host of players to leave either on loan or on permanent deals, Chelsea's squad already looks desperately thin.

Conte gave 20-year-old academy graduate Jeremie Boga a debut against Burnley and had four untested youngsters-Charly Musonda, Andreas Christensen, Fikayo Tomori and Kyle Scott-on the bench.

Star signing Alvaro Morata came off the bench to score and set up a goal for David Luiz, but the man he was bought to replace, Diego Costa, continues to provide distracting background noise.

Exiled in his native Brazil after being told by Conte he has no place at Chelsea, Costa hit out at the club in a Daily Mail interview published on Monday, accusing them of treating him like a "criminal".

The turbulence seems to be having an effect on Conte, who has appeared short-tempered in some of his early-season dealings with the media.

'MOURINHO SEASON'

He also sharply criticised his players after the game against Burnley, saying they had lost their heads over Cahill's 14th-minute dismissal for a foul on Steven Defour. "I think it's affecting Conte, the way he's behaving, the way he's responding and reacting," said former Chelsea goalkeeper Mark Schwarzer.

"Particularly look after this game where he's saying that the players lost the plot. "Normally a manager who has the full support of his team, or feels he has the full support of his team, wouldn't come out (to criticise them) and he'd defend his players.

"In this instance, he hasn't, so it just seems that there's a very unhappy camp at the moment." Conte spent the close season issuing warnings about the dangers of Chelsea suffering a repeat of their 2015-16 campaign, which he refers to as the "Mourinho season". Since 2006, only two title-winning managers-Manchester United's Alex Ferguson and Manchester City's Manuel Pellegrini-have still been in their jobs by the end of the following

Chelsea's false start saw the odds of Conte leaving his post before the end of the season shortened to 13/8 by British bookmakers. But amid reports that Chelsea are looking to bring in four new players before the transfer window closes on August 31, Conte says the only solution to their predicament is hard work. "I

am not worried," he said. "It's important for me that we don't close our eyes, but focus on our mistakes, work and improve. "We have to give all of ourselves, to try to put in 120 percent, every single person. I must be the first, then the staff and then the players." — AFP

POCHETTINO EYES END TO TRANSFER DROUGHT

NEWCASTLE: Mauricio Pochettino insists Tottenham Hotspur's 2-0 victory at Newcastle United in their Premier League opener has not altered his desire to finally strengthen his squad before the transfer deadline. Pochettino remains aware Tottenham lack the depth and quality to compete in four competitions this season after failing to make a single close-season signing while their rivals all spent big money on new recruits.

The Spurs boss was encouraged that they started the season by winning a game that was finely balanced until Newcastle's Jonjo Shelvey was sent off early in the second half on Sunday. Newly-promoted Newcastle had coped comfortably with the Tottenham attack, but Shelvey's foolish stamp on Dele Alli was the turning point.

Goals from Alli and Ben Davies punished Shelvey's rush of blood, but Pochettino still wants to bring in new players before the transfer window shuts at the end of August as he aims to emulate last season's title challenge. "It was important to start with three points, but it wasn't a great game and wasn't our best performance. The most important thing for me was starting the season in the right way," he said.

"The balance of the team is the main thing and we need some new players to bring some new energy. It is important to challenge your best players and refresh the squad. "We are calm enough to compete in the same way as we competed last season, but we need to sign some players before the end of the transfer window. "We have 10 months to go and we are involved in four competitions, so we need more competition, more quality and more

people who can help keep the level we want to show in every game."

Pochettino insisted that Tottenham

would have triumphed even if Shelvey had stayed on the pitch, although there was little evidence to support that claim. "Of course we would have won. But it was difficult to play because the pitch was so dry and Newcastle played deep," he said.

"It was difficult to find space to create chances. In the second half we played against 10 men and that always helps and made it more comfortable for us."

MATURITY

Pochettino singled out the contributions of Alli and Christian Eriksen, but 20year-old right-back Kyle Walker-Peters was named man of the match after replacing near namesake Kyle Walker following his move to Manchester City.


"He was so calm," said the Tottenham manager. "To play as he played showed real maturity and was really happy. He even gave a speech after the game with his manof-the-match trophy.

"He was so proud and it was a fantastic moment he will always remember." Shelvey, who now faces a three-match suspension and a club fine, apologised to manager Rafael Benitez and his team-mates in the dressing room after the game.

"The rules are the rules and he made a mistake," said Benitez. But Benitez also claimed that a tackle from Tottenham's Harry Kane that ended Florian Lejeune's involvement in the game was a worse challenge, although it only merited a yellow card from the referee Andre Marriner.—AFP **Justin Thomas picks** right major at the right time to win

BARCELONA: Cristiano Ronaldo lost his cool, and now Real Madrid has lost its main man for five matches at the start of the Spanish season.

Ronaldo was suspended for one game for the red card in Sunday's Super Cup first leg at Barcelona, and four games for pushing referee Ricardo de Burgos Bengoetxea in the back, the Spanish football federation said.

Ronaldo will miss tomorow's return leg of the Super Cup in Madrid plus the first four matches of Real Madrid's league title defense. Zinedine Zidane's Madrid opens the league on Sunday at Deportivo La Coruna. Its next three

matches after that are against Valencia, promoted Levante, and at Real Sociedad.

Ronaldo and Madrid have 10 days to appeal the federation's ruling. Still regaining peak fitness after an extended summer vacation, Ronaldo began the Super Cup match on the bench, and

came on in the 58th minute. He scored with a long-range strike to put Madrid 2-1 up in the 80th minute, moments after Lionel Messi had equalized for Barcelona from the penalty spot. But Ronaldo's goal celebration - when he took his shirt off and flexed his muscles - earned him a yellow card. Two minutes later, he charged into the area and collided with Barcelona defender Samuel Umtiti. Ronaldo went down hoping for a penalty. Instead, referee De Burgos showed him a second yellow for diving and sent him off.

Ronaldo raised his arms in disbelief, then stepped up to De Burgos and shoved him in the back with his right hand. The federation ruling said that Ronaldo's shove violated article 96 of its disciplinary code, which states that "light aggressions" defined as "pulling, pushing and shaking" of a referee are punished by suspensions of

between 4-12 matches.

RONALDO FINED

The federation also fined Ronaldo 3,005 euros (\$3,500) and Madrid 1,400 euros (\$1,650) for the shove, and another 600 euros (\$705) for the player and 350 euros (\$412) for the club for simulating a foul. Last season, Las Palmas forward Marko Livaja was given an additional four-match suspension for pushing a referee after he was shown

In the 2014 Spanish Super Cup, Atletico Madrid coach Diego Simeone was handed an eight match suspension after he tapped the back of a linesman's head. Simeone was suspended for four games for the tapping, two games for protesting, one game for ironically applauding the referee, and one game for remaining in the stands instead of leaving the stadium after his sending-off. Simeone served four matches of his league suspension and the other four are pending Atletico's future Spanish Super Cup matches. After guiding Madrid to the Champions League and Spanish league titles last season, the suspension comes during a difficult summer for Ronaldo. In June, a state prosecutor accused Ronaldo of defrauding Spain's tax office of 14.7 million euros (\$16.5 million). The 32-year-old star had to deny the accusations in person to an investigative judge last month.

Now he must trust his teammates to make a good start to Madrid's defense without him. Given Marco Asensio's great goal from distance to cap Sunday's win over Barcelona, the 21-yearold forward could take Ronaldo's place in the starting lineup. — AP

But it was 23-year-old Pandya, batting in just his third Test after debuting in Galle, who stole the show with the century that had lifted India to an unassailable 487. Sri Lanka offered just 135 in reply in their first innings against the world's top Test side.

"You know, a guy who can get a fifty and a hundred in his first three games batting at number eight has to have something special in him," Kohli told reporters after the match.

"He brings in great balance to the team, he's a gun

fielder and gives you those crucial breakthroughs... we absolutely have 120 per cent faith in him."

Rookie spinner Kuldeep Yadav also made his mark with four wickets in Sri Lanka's first innings as the islanders conceded a 352-run first innings lead.

Playing in just his second Test, the 22-year-old bamboozled the hosts with his left-arm wrist spin, returning overall match figures of 5-96.

Ashwin kept up the pressure on the beleaguered

hosts with four wickets on the third day, including top-scorer Niroshan Dickwella for 41. "We are a young side. We look forward to playing Test cricket with the same kind of excitement. That's

the only way you can be ruthless... we like to be proactive rather than reactive," said Kohli. "We have age on our side. We have an opportuni-

ty to play together for five-six years with this whole bunch and this really excites us."

'TOUGH SERIES'

Sri Lankan skipper Dinesh Chandimal, who made

36, put up some resistance during his 65-run fifth-

wicket stand with Angelo Mathews.

But Kuldeep took Chandimal's wicket just after lunch, with Ashwin claiming Mathews Ibw for 35 not long after. Shami, who took three wickets, combined with Ashwin to mop up the tail as Sri Lanka suffered their second successive innings defeat after a drubbing in Colombo. "A tough series as a team. Credit goes to India. They have played outstandingly well in the series... losing within two and half days you cannot give any excuses," said Chandimal.

"Hardik batted brilliantly when he came out to the middle. The first spell by Shami and Umesh (Yadav) was brilliant." ZVEREV UPSETS FEDERER

MONTREAL: Alexander Zverev's hot streak is still alive. Roger Federer's win streak is over. The German beat Federer 6-3, 6-4 in the Rogers Cup final on Sunday for his 10th consecutive victory. The 20-year-old Zverev, the winner last week in Washington, D.C., matched Federer with a fifth tournament title this year. He also stopped Federer's win

streak at 16. He will try to keep it going at an event in Cincinnati this week. "It's something amazing, back-to-back weeks," said Zverev, who handed Federer only his third loss of the year. "I feel great. "I feel like I'm playing some of the best tennis of my life. But Cincinnati is a very tough draw. I don't know if I will be able to go far there because I am a little bit tired. But game-wise and confidence-wise, I'm super happy the way everything is standing."

He avenged a loss to Federer at Halle, Germany on June 25 and evened their career

head-to-head record at two wins apiece. The fourth-seeded Zverev won \$894,585 while the second-seeded Federer got \$438,635.

Zverev used some sharp groundstrokes to get the only service break he needed to win the first set. The lanky German escaped a break point at 1-0 in the second set with consecutive aces, and an off-looking Federer never challenged again. The 36-year-old Federer said he only felt "aches and pains" from playing in his first tournament of the hardcourt

season, but it looked to be more than that. Zverev said he only noticed that his opponent's serve wasn't quite as hard. He broke a mistake-prone Federer for a 4-3 lead and served out the match. He will climb to seventh in world rankings with the win, his second Masters 1000 Series victory this year along with Rome, and is looking more and more like a future Grand Slam tournament winner.—AP

Wage hikes for part-time workers in Japan have accelerated, rising to 2.3 percent year-onyear in May from 0.7 percent in August 2016. Salaries for full-time workers, though, have been little changed. Susumu Ikeda, 70, says shoppers are buying more at his musical instrument shop in Tokyo's tony Ginza shopping district, and senses the economy is taking a turn for the better.

"Some may be cynical about our growth, but compared to our worst we are getting much better." he said. Furniture maker Nitori Holdings Ltd, convenience store leader Seven & i Holdings Co and coffee shop chain Doutor Nichires Holdings all reported rising domestic sales in their recent earnings reports.

Sales of new cars accelerated in April-June from the previous quarter, and GDP data showed higher purchases of appliances, such as air conditioners. Private consumption - which accounts for almost 60 percent of GDP - rose in the second quarter at the fastest pace in more than three years, offering the most definitive sign yet that consumers have shaken off the impact of a sales tax hike in 2014. For some, like 31-year-old Tokyo office workei Natsuki Abe, the economy just feels healthier.

"I do think the economy is doing better than it was before, but it's just a feeling," she said. "My company is doing well, and I think I do have the money to spend on things that I like and want. I mainly spend on clothes, as I want to look good."

COMPETING FOR WORKERS

There have been previous such advances that have turned out to be temporary during Japan's many years of economic weakness since the early 1990s, with consumer spending often a culprit as it loses momentum. This time may be different, though, some economists argue. That is because the unemployment rate is now low enough - 2.8 percent - to lift wages

Many economists say Japan reaches full employment, the lowest level of joblessness before upward wage pressures arise, when the jobless rate falls to 3 percent.

Japan's aging population, and the resulting inflation; core consumer prices rose a meager 0.4 big drop in the size of its workforce, is a major reason for this. "Wage growth will accelerate going forward, because companies have to raise wages to compete for new workers and to retain workers," said Takuji Adia, chief economist at Societe Generale. "This happens when the unemployment rate falls below 3 percent."

When Prime Minister Shinzo Abe took office in late 2012, the jobless rate was at 4.3 percent. Consumer spending boomed as a stock-market rally fuelled optimism about the new government but then lost momentum because wages were not rising that much. Some of Abe's structural reforms, such as narrowing the wage gap between contractors and full-time employees doing the same work, raising the minimum wage, and encouraging people to move to better-paying jobs, are also starting to pay off.

DEFLATIONARY MINDSET

One major concern is that Japan's consumer spending revival has yet to translate into faster percent in the year to June and inflation expectations remain weak.

The United States and Europe are also struggling to generate inflation despite improving growth, but Japan's case is peculiar because of the decades of deflation and stagnation following the collapse of the bubble economy in the early 1990s.

That's produced a deflationary mindset among many people that cannot easily be changed. And as the country's population shrinks and ages, saving for the future has become a top priority for many.

"My husband's parents and my parents are getting old, and their pensions will not be enough for them to sustain themselves," said Chisa Tsubuki, a 28-year-old childcare worker. "So in anticipation for the future where nursing and healthcare costs will rise for us, we need to save."

Still, the economy looks like it is at long last starting to move in the direction the Bank of Japan predicted. — Reuters

OIL BULLS RETURN, US PRODUCTION, STOCKS DRIVE MARKET

NBK ECONOMIC REPORT

KUWAIT: Oil prices made a strong comeback in July, reversing the bear trend of the last couple of months and returning to the symbolic \$50 per barrel mark. Markets witnessed a reversal in sentiment in July, sparked by several factors including: OPEC banding together to recommit to production cuts; US inventories declining rapidly; and signs of slowing US production. Crude oil benchmark prices reached their 2month peak at the end of July, rising to \$52.65 per barrel (bbl) for Brent and \$50.17/bbl for West Texas Intermediate (WTI). By July's close, Brent and WTI had increased by 9.9 percent and 9.0 percent monthon-month (m/m), respectively, and by 24.0 percent and 20.6 percent year-on-year (y/y), respectively.

US crude oil production has been on the rise since the second half of 2016, threatening the coordinated supply cut efforts of OPEC/non-OPEC. The 4week moving average of US crude oil production grew 10.9 percent y/y in the week ending 28 July, with production at 9.4 mb/d.

But the outlook for US production has shifted slightly to a more conservative one in recent weeks as the pace of growth in rig counts started to moderate. The total US oil rig count increased by just 2 in the week ending 28 July-well below the 3-month moving average of 5-to bring the total count to 766. But what really sparked the rally in the oil market was the drawdown in US crude stocks. US crude stocks fell dramatically in July by a cumulative weekly total of 24.2 million barrels; crude inventories are now back to January 2016 levels.




After meeting in St. Petersburg on 24 July 2017, the Joint OPEC/Non-OPEC Ministerial Monitoring Committee (JMMC) reviewed the first six months since the coordinated cuts pledge in December 2016's "Declaration". Member countries such as Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE have promised to cut back crude exports. Saudi Arabia announced that it will limit exports to 6.6 mb/d for August, a million barrels lower y/y. Nigeria, which has been exempt



from the cuts, pledged to cap production at 1.8 mb/d this year.

Meanwhile, the Russian oil minister stated that Russia had reduced its output by 310,000 b/d by the end of July compared to October 2016, and that Russia was set to meet its obligation.

The latest OPEC secondary source data showed that the group's total supply increased in June to 32.44 mb/d from May's 32.05 mb/d, driven higher by output increases in Libya and Nigeria, the two nonparticipants in the OPEC supply cut agreement. This moves the group farther away from its target of 31.75 mb/d, with the overall compliance level dropping from 105 percent in May to 94 percent in June. The net reduction of OPEC crude production had been closer to 1.0 mb/d earlier in the year, but the increase in production reversed the rebalancing effort, bringing the net change down to approximately 0.5 mb/d.



Fundamentals

US crude stock figures, the most closely tracked indicator by the oil markets, are expected to decline further as we move into August. The International Energy Agency (IEA) expects global demand growth to continue to outpace supply growth, with the deficit supported by further drawdowns on global crude stocks in 2H17.

We think that a total draw of approximately 240 million barrels by the end of 2017 is possible. US shale producers are also facing headwinds, as the weakening of oil prices to below the \$50 bbl mark has forced them to reduce capital expenditure on drilling projects.

The second half of the year should, therefore, see some of those factors supportive of oil prices, such as stock drawdowns and tighter crude production, increasingly come into play. Markets will be keenly watching for prices to firm up.

BREXIT CAMPAIGNERS LAUNCH BID TO OUST PRO-EU FINANCE MINISTER

LONDON: One of the most vocal pro-Brexit campaign groups launched a campaign yesterday to oust finance minister Philip Hammond from parliament, saying he is part of a plot to stop Britain leaving the European Union. Divisions over Britain's Brexit strategy have resurfaced after Prime Minister Theresa May lost her parliamentary majority in an ill-judged snap election in June, generating renewed political pressure from some quarters for a softer exit.

Hammond has led calls for a multi-year, staggered break from the EU in the name of protecting the British economy, much to the annoyance of some Brexiteers who want a more decisive divorce when Britain's membership ends in March 2019.

That has put Hammond in the crosshairs of campaign group Leave.EU, whose grassroots organization helped bring about last year's referendum vote to leave the bloc. "He is part of a cabal of Westminster MPs (Members of Parliament) who believe that if they can delay exit, they can overturn the wishes of the 52 percent who despite threats from the political classes drew upon the courage of their conviction at the ballot box," said Leave.EU Chairman Arron Banks in a letter to voters in Hammond's constituency. There is no automatic means for voters to get rid of their local member of parliament outside of an election period, and Britain is not scheduled to hold another vote

But Leave.EU called on their supporters to pressure the ocal Conservative Party not to select him as their candidate at the next election. The group has also targeted interior minister Amber Rudd, who only won her seat by a slim majority in June. —Reuters

KENYA'S MARKET HITS 14-MONTH HIGH AFTER KENYATTA VICTORY

NAIROBI: Kenya's main stock index rose 2.51 percent on Monday to a 14-month high, building on gains last week as investors welcomed the re-election of President Uhuru Kenyatta.

The NSE-20 index has risen nearly 7 percent since the election last Tuesday. Kenyatta was declared winner by a clear margin on Friday but his main challenger, Raila Odinga, has not yet conceded.

At least 24 people have been killed in pockets of protests against the outcome of the vote. mainly in two Nairobi slums. But businesses reopened yesterday, shrugging off a boycott call by Odinga.

A dispute after an election in 2007, which Odinga also lost, sparked widescale protests and violence that killed 1,200 people and hammered the economy. Aly Khan Satchu, an independent trader and analyst in Nairobi, said the market worried that Odinga, who identifies himself as a social democrat, would have changed the economy's course. "The markets were concerned around a left-

ist 'Magufuli'-like tilt which would have eroded Kenya's hard won free market credentials. So part of this rally is a relief rally," he told Reuters, referring to President John Magufuli of neighboring Tanzania. Kenyatta, the 55-year-old son of the country's founding president, engaged regularly with the business community in his first term to try to boost economic growth and job creation. His family also owns a range of

The Kenyan shilling firmed yesterday to touch an intra-day high of 103.65 per dollar, from 104 before the election, while Kenyan dollar bonds have also rallied after the election. Yesterday's gains by the blue chip index

were led by electricity distributor Kenya Power, which was up 9 percent and lender KCB Group, which was up 8 percent. Ken Miniire, the head of securities at Genghis Capital, said investors had been encouraged by endorsements of the election by various foreign observer groups. The main local observer group also said the

official result was in line with their tally. "The international investors are more or less confident," he said. Kenyan shares had slightly lagged this year's gains in other African bourses like Nigeria as investors waited to see how the election would go, market participants said. "This means there is a ton of liquidity that is set to enter the market and underpin valuations," Satchu said. — Reuters

SUDAN'S INFLATION TOPS 34% IN JULY

KHARTOUM: Sudan's annual inflation rate rose to 34.23 percent in July from 32.63 in June, the central statistics office said yesterday, partly reflecting the postponement of a US decision on whether to lift economic sanctions permanently. The Sudanese pound has weakened and prices have climbed since the United States said on July 11 it was deferring the sanctions decision for three months.

"The prices are increasing on a daily basis, and we can't live like this. Our income is the same ... and the government doesn't care about the people, and we don't know what will happen or what we should do to be able to live," said Rabab Ahmed, a 38-year-old day labourer.

Sudan says it has complied with all US demands for lifting sanctions over human rights and other issues, which have been in place for 20 years and have hobbled the economy. Former US President Barack Obama temporarily lifted the sanctions for six months in January, suspending a trade embargo, unfreezing assets and removing financial sanctions. But the United States said in June it was still "very concerned" about human rights. —Reuters

very day, thousands of passengers in the Middle East will board a flight bound for any one of the hundreds of destinations served by the region's airlines. And when you got to your destination, did you feel less tired and jet-lagged than you expected to?

If the answer to all the questions is affirmative, it was very likely that you were experiencing the Boeing 787 Dreamliner and its Boeing Sky Interior. The sense of relief you felt when stepping onboard the plane was the result of using an ageold architectural technique - compression and release - commonly employed in the construction of religious monuments and modern hotels. After queuing through the tunnel-like bridge, the aircraft's entrance is specifically designed to give passengers a psychological sense of relief and space when they board the plane.



Each aspect is meticulously well-thoughtout and refined, using a combination of science, passenger feedback, and practicality, with the goal of contributing to the overall customer

By placing emphasis on the details that matter to the comfort and well-being of the passenger, we always strive to better that journey for the people who travel on our airplanes. And when airplanes - such as the Dreamliner and the 777X - set new benchmarks for passenger comfort, they do so entirely by design.

INVESTORS PONDER FURTHER SHOCKS AFTER N KOREA JOLT financial crisis that began a decade ago,

LONDON: After this week's war of words between the United States and North Korea triggered the biggest fall in global stocks since the US presidential election, investors are wondering what other off-radar shocks may be waiting to rock world markets. Although there is little sign so far that investors are protecting themselves against a major sell-off, some say the current environment masks latent risks.

"Every day, our risk models tell us to take more risk because of falling volatility but with markets being where they are, we have to be very careful in not following them blindly," said James Kwok, head of currency management at Amundi in London. "So we try to project scenarios on what can go wrong and where are markets not looking."

Such has been the extraordinary period of stability in financial markets in recent years that world stocks have hit a series of record highs while gauges of broad market volatility have plunged to record lows. That benign investment environment has been fostered by central banks which have pumped vast sums of cash into economies since the global

lifting asset prices globally. Flows into most asset classes have

already overtaken peaks reached before the financial crisis. For example, inflows into active and passive equity funds have nearly doubled to \$10.9 trillion at the end of June 2017 from a September 2007 peak, according to Thomson Reuters Lipper data. Inflows into bonds have meanwhile increased nearly three-fold to \$4.1 trillion in that period.

Gauges of risk

Broad market gauges of risk, such as the CBOE Volatility Index, better known as the VIX, and its bond market counterpart, the Merrill Lynch Option volatility index remain pinned near record lows despite a spike this week. But analysts say low market volatility masks the heavy weight of options written on these gauges by investment banks betting that the calm conditions will persist for a long time. That has been accompanied by the growing popularity of inverse-volatility ETF products, which have doubled in value this year as market volatility has cratered. —Reuters

CHINA A SWEET SPOT FOR US COMPANIES' EARNINGS IN Q2

SHANGHAI: Trade tensions between Washington and Beijing may be running high but Corporate America is finding China to be a reliable source of profit growth this year.

Whether they sell construction equipment, semiconductors or coffee, many major US companies have reported stronger second-quarter earnings and revenue from their Chinese operations in recent weeks. They are benefiting from a Chinese economy that is growing at almost 7 percent, several times the rate of US expansion, a Chinese housing boom, and a slide in the US dollar, which makes American exports more competitive and increases dollar earnings once they are translated from foreign currencies.

Chinese President Xi Jinping's ambitious plan to build a new Silk Road that will improve links between China and dozens of countries in Asia and Europe, and includes many billions of dollars of new roads, bridges, railways and power plants is also helping American firms to sell heavy equipment and other products. Caterpillar Inc, a bellwether for industrial demand in China and beyond, reported its sales in Asia-Pacific rose 25 percent in the second quarter - thanks to China. Shipments of large excavators to Chinese customers more than doubled in the first half of the year.

"We now expect demand in China to remain strong through the rest of the year," Brad Halverson, Caterpillar's group president and chief financial officer, told investors. Caterpillar's Japanese rivals Komatsu and Hitachi Construction Machinery Co reported similar strength in

demand for heavy machinery. Komatsu's China sales almost doubled in the firm's April-June quarter.

"China's grown pretty well relative to the US over this period and the currency's relationship has changed in favor of the US companies," said Jim Paulsen, chief investment strategist at the Leuthold Group in Minneapolis.

Discrimination clams

Chinese companies are also benefiting from the robust domestic economy. For example, Chinese auto manufacturer Geely Automobile Holdings announcing last week that its July sales climbed 89 percent from the year-earlier-month. Geely and many other major Chinese companies report their results in the next few weeks. American companies in China have been collectively reporting better prospects even as they complain that the Chinese authorities are not allowing them enough access to parts of the Chinese market and discriminating against them as they seek to compete against Chinese rivals.

The Trump administration has been considering punitive tariffs against a range of Chinese goods but it has held off on taking action after Beijing backed tougher United Nations Security Council sanctions against North Korea earlier this month.

And despite some negatives in the Sino-US relationship, a July report by the American Chamber of Commerce in Shanghai showed that 82 percent of US companies in China expect revenues to increase this year, up from 76 percent a year ago. "In general China is still a growth market for lots of US goods and services... the Chinese consumer is driving more and more the growth in China itself - that's a very positive shift in compositional growth for a lot of US companies that do provide goods and services for consumers, as opposed to building skyscrapers," said Joe Quinlan, head of thematic investing at Bank of America, US Trust.

In the chip industry, Skywork Solutions, which according to Goldman Sachs gets about 85 percent of its sales from China, reported its fiscal third-quarter revenue rose 20 percent, thanks in part to demand from Chinese phone maker Huawei. And Qualcomm, which gets around two thirds of its revenue from China, said last month that China remained a strong growth story for the company.

And many other foreign companies are also doing well. The European liquor industry is benefiting from a resurgence in Chinese consumer demand. Remy Cointreau, which battled a steep slowdown in China after Xi launched an anti-corruption drive in 2012 - hitting a lot of lavish wing and dining by businesses - said it saw a "clear improvement in consumption trends" this year.

"We see the fast-growing upper middle class driving strong consumption growth for our upmarket cognac brands," the company's Chief Financial Officer Luca Marotta said last month. Closer to home, Kweichow Moutai, the Chinese maker of the liquor baiiiu and the world's largest alcohol firm by

value, saw first half profits gain 27.8 percent. Chinese stock market gains this year have in turn helped confidence among retail investors. "I feel the wider economy is improving," said Ding Mingwei, 26, a manager at an education technology company in Shanghai. Ding, who says his own investments are up this year, now plans to spend more on hotels, dining out and funding hobbies such as playing the guitar.

For some companies, China growth helped to offset problems elsewhere. Starbucks U.S. growth cooled in the third quarter but same-store sales for the coffee chain in China surged 7 percent.

Among the Japanese companies to benefit, Sony's sales in China were up just under 50 percent in the three months to June, making it the electronic group's fastest-growing geographic segment.

Competition intensifies

There are some sectors that are proving a tougher slog for foreign companies. Major international automakers, even those reporting increased revenues, have pointed to squeezed margins in one of the world's most competitive markets. US automaker General Motors, for example, saw a strong April-June quarter, but said it faced "pricing challenges".

And some economists warn that it is unclear how long the Chinese economy and the markets can keep their buzz. "The strong rebound is largely being driven by the property market and export growth, which both seem unsustainable," said Nomura Chief China Economist Yang Zhao in Hong Kong. He said he expects China's economic growth to cool by the fourth quarter. — Reuters

WALL ST CLIMBS AS NORTH KOREA TENSION EASES

NEW YORK: Wall Street opened higher yesterday, South Korea's president said resolving with broad gains across sectors, as investor sentiment was lifted by easing tensions in the Korean peninsula after key US officials played down the risk of an imminent war with North Korea. All the 11 major S&P sectors were higher, with S&P financial's 1.12 percent rise leading the gainers.

Global stocks lost nearly \$1 trillion last week after President Donald Trump warned North Korea that it would face "fire and fury" if it threatened the United States, leading to a war of words between Pyongyang and Washington. However, US officials including National Security Adviser H.R. McMaster and CIA Director Mike Pompeo played down the risk on Sunday, while

Pyongyang's nuclear ambitions must be done peacefully. "Feels as though the North Korean tension seems to be abating a bit, with commentary coming out of China and the United States. But the situation seems to have de-escalated in the near term", said Art Hogan, chief market strategist at Wunderlich Securities.

"After the one and a half percent self-off last week, we got a bit of a investor attitude to buy the dip," Hogan said. At 9:39 am ET (1339 GMT), the Dow Jones industrial average was up 129.25 points, or 0.59 percent, at 21,987.57 and the S&P 500 was up 19.63 points, or 0.80 percent, at 2,460.95.The Nasdaq Composite was up 61.57 points, or 0.98 percent, at 6,318.12.

The Swiss franc posted its biggest daily drop against the U.S. dollar in nearly three weeks yesterday as investor concern over geopolitical risks eased and Japan posted solid economic data. "Some investors had gone very short on risk last week on the geopolitical events and there is some short covering," Neil Jones, head of FX sales at Mizuho Bank in London, said. The franc fell 0.8 percent against the U.S. dollar to 0.9694 francs, its biggest drop since July 27 according to Thomson Reuters data. It gained more than 1 percent last week on

MARKET VOLATILITY WEIGHS ON INVESTOR SENTIMENT

A DECLINE IN IPO ACTIVITY IN Q2 2017

DUBAI: After a positive start to the year, IPO performance in the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) in the second quarter (Q2) of 2017 witnessed a slowdown in both the number of offerings and total proceeds raised. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia ("KSA") hosted the only (three) IPOs of this quarter; they were allocated between Saudi Stock Exchange primary market ("Tadawul") and the parallel market ("NOMU"). On the primary exchange front, the only offering in Q2 2017 was by Jadwa REIT Alharamin FUND ("the Fund"), which floated a total of 36 million shares, raising proceeds of \$96 million. The primary objective of the Fund is to provide its investors with current

income by investing in income-generating real estate assets in Saudi Arabia, with a principal focus on the Holy Cities of Makkah and Medina.

On the parallel market front, the first and largest offering in Q2 2017 was by Thob Al-Aseel Co ("Al Aseel"), which floated 3 million shares, raising proceeds of USD 68 million. Al Aseel is engaged in import,

export, wholesale and retail in textiles and readymade garments. The second offering was by Al Kathiri Holding Co ("Al-Khathiri"), which floated 0.8 million shares, raising proceeds of USD 6.7 million. Al Khathiri manufactures and distributes construction materials through its subsidiaries.

Period to period performance

In terms of IPO performance in Q2 2017 compared to the same period in the prior year, the number of offerings has slightly increased, with three IPOs in Q2 2017 compared to two IPOs in Q2 2016; however the total proceeds raised in Q2 2017 was 38 percent lower compared to Q2 2016. Further, IPO activity in the first half of 2017 ("H1 2017"), witnessed an increase in the number of offerings (13) compared to H1 2016 (three), which was largely due to the increased activity in Q1 2017; however proceeds raised in H2 2017 were 23 percent lower as compared to H1 2016.

Steve Drake, Head of PwC's Capital Markets and Accounting Advisory Services team in the Middle East said: "During Q2 2017, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia continued to be the main driver of IPO market activity in the GCC, while the NOMU parallel market for small and medium-sized enterprises in the Kingdom remained popular among investors."

Global IPOs

Against a backdrop of lower political uncertainty and normalizing monetary conditions, equity markets displayed an upward trend, volatility remained low and listing conditions were favorable. Political uncertainties in Europe decreased with the victory of Macron in France's presidential election, and his party in subsequent parliamentary elections. Voting in the UK led to a hung parlia-

ment, which is likely to lead to further uncertainty surrounding the path of Brexit negotiations, which officially began on June 19th. Finally, Trump's tax and infrastructure plans remain mired in uncertainties, as the Administration is having to deal with an investigation into links with Russia and calls for the President's impeachment.

The last few days of June marked a stark reversal for global monetary policy, with Draghi and Carney delivering nearly simultaneous hawkish statements. A few days earlier, the Federal Reserve had raised rates for the second time this year, and begun discussions on unwinding its massive balance sheet. Nevertheless, inflation is not picking up, and pressures even eased as the price of oil fell to a nine-month low in June. Further global IPO activity in Q2 2017 increased by nearly 50 percent in terms of both proceeds and the number of IPOs compared to Q2 2016. Compared to Q1 2017, activity also increased in Q2 2017, though less pronouncedly. In total, 379 IPOs raised \$52.6 billion compared to \$35.2 billion via 253 IPOs in Q2 2016 and \$68 billion via 420 IPOs in Q2 2015.

Asia-Pacific was dominant in terms of the number of IPOs again, accounting for 57 percent (216) of global transactions. EMEA and the Americas accounted for 22 percent (84) and 21 percent (78), respectively. Nonetheless, in terms of proceeds, the Americas was almost on a par with Asia-Pacific. Both accounted for 36 percent of money raised in Q2 2017, yet proceeds in Asia-Pacific were slightly higher at \$19.1 billion, compared to \$18.7 billion in the Americas. Finally, EMEA accounted for 28 percent (\$14.8 billion) of proceeds. For the year as a whole, the Americas still ranks first in terms of money raised.

Bond and sukuk markets

The appetite for debt issuance in the GCC surged throughout Q2 2017. Sovereign issuance by GCC governments remained the main theme, whilst the quarter saw KSA issue its first US dollar denominated sukuk, raising proceeds of \$9 billion. The GCC main economies main-

tained high credit quality and investment grade status.

Bond Issuances

Corporate bond issuance remained very active across the region while sovereign bond issuance activity slowed down in Q2 2017. In the UAE, Industrial & Commercial Bank of China Limited - Dubai Branch ("ICBC") listed three bonds on Nasdaq Dubai, amounting to \$400 million, \$300 million and EUR 500 million. In KSA, ACWA Power Management and Investments ("ACWA"), issued bonds amounting to \$814 million. In Kuwait, National Bank of Kuwait (NBK) issued non-guaranteed bonds of \$750 million as part of its medium-term bonds issue program.

Sukuk Issuances

On the sovereign front, the government of KSA was the biggest contributor in the region, issuing a USD 9 billion Islamic sukuk, followed by Sultanate of Oman's ("Oman") \$2 billion issuance. The KSA sukuk was structured into a \$4.5 billion five-year sukuk tranche at 100 basis points over the mid-swap rate and an equal-sized 10-year tranche at a spread of 140 basis points to the benchmark. The Oman seven year sukuk was structured at 235 basis points to the benchmark.

On the corporate front, Dar Al-Arkan Sukuk Company Ltd issued a \$500 million sukuk. The issuance received significant interest from international market participants with the order book close to SAR 4 billion (\$1.05 billion), equal to two times of the amount issued. "Debt issuance in the GCC countries remained popular throughout Q2 2017 as GCC governments' sovereign issuance were oversubscribed domestically and internationally. However, consecutive interest rate hikes by US Federal Reserve may hamper GCC government debt appetite, while a hawkish policy would trigger a surge in borrowing cost across the global and regional debt market".

RUSSIA-LINKED HACKERS TARGET HOTEL GUESTS ACROSS EUROPE

FRANKFURT: A cyber-spying group with suspected links to Russian military intelligence was probably behind a campaign targeting hotel guests in eight mostly European countries last month, researchers at security firm FireEye said on Friday. The espionage group, dubbed APT 28, sought to steal password credentials from Western government and business travelers using hotel Wi-Fi networks, in order then to infect their organizational networks back home, FireEye said in a report.

The wave of attacks during the first week of July targeted travelers who were staying in several hotel chains in at least seven countries in Europe and one in the Middle East, it said. These preliminary findings are the latest to allege that Russia is engaged in far-flung hacking activity aimed at governments, businesses and election campaigns, including Hillary Clinton's unsuccessful White House bid last year.

firms have linked APT 28 to the GRU, Russia's military intelligence directorate. Other researchers have tracked the same pattern of attacks, but stopped short of linking APT 28 to the Russian state. Moscow vehemently denies the accusations. Benjamin Read, manager of cyber espionage analysis for US-based FireEye, said the technical exploits and remote chain of command used to mount the attacks all clearly pointed to APT 28, whose vast scope of activities his firm has detailed

"We are moderately confident in our assessment," Read told Reuters, saying this was because the technical inquiry was still in its early days. "We just don't have the smoking gun yet." The latest attempts were identified and thwarted in the initial infiltration stage. But similar methods were used in the autumn of 2016 at hotels in Europe,

Several governments and security research and managed to breach the computer of a US government employee, he said.

In the July attacks, FireEye found spear-phishing emails were used to trick hotel employees to download an infected hotel reservation document, which then installed GAMEFISH malware run remotely from internet sites known to be controlled by APT 28. This foothold gave the cyber spies control over guest Wi-Fi networks and could help them grab passwords of targeted victims and sniff unencrypted data being transmitted to shared network drives in the up-market, businessclass hotels of major cities.

"We did not observe any guest credentials being stolen. However there were multiple hotel chains targeted and we don't know the full extent of the operation," Read said. The July attacks took advantage of a recently leaked piece of malicious software known as EternalBlue, believed to have been stolen from the US National Security Agency, giving hackers a highly sophisticated way to move silently inside organizations' networks once they infect even a single machine.

It was also EternalBlue that fuelled the worldwide spread of WannaCry ransomware in May and the NotPetya attack against Ukraine in June, which fanned out globally to hit dozens of major firms. The 2016 hotel attacks tricked one user with a fake Adobe Flash update and were likely launched by a nearby hacker on the same guest Wi-Fi network, FireEye said. APT 28 logged into the guest's webbased Outlook email account 12 hours later, it said. The government employee returned to the United States and the infection spread to their agency when their computer was reconnected to the network, Read said. He declined to comment on how far the attack reached or whether it caused any damage.—Reuters



SONIC MANIA PAINTS OVER ITS PROBLEMS THAN FIXING THEM

ith Sonic Mania, Sega has done the unthinkable for a corporate player in video games: They've given it to the fans. Sega has had a nightmarish time trying to rekindle the magic and majesty of its iconic mascot since the blue hedgehog's peak in the '90s. After the Genesis console faded, Sega went an entire hardware generation without a "proper" flagship Sonic release on the Saturn. With the jump to 3D in 1999's Sonic Adventure, the series retained its flash, but something was fundamentally broken in the translation. While some fans defend the Sonic oeuvre from the Dreamcast onward, the series' best days were behind it, reaching its absolute nadir with 2006's disastrous Sonic the Hedgehog.

Since then, Sega has tried to reinvent the

whether or not many assets have been pulled directly from existing Sonic games. It certainly looks like a Genesis game, or rather, a Sega CD release - animations are more detailed than I remember them being from the cartridge titles, though the color palette feels like it came directly from the Genesis.

This extends to the way Sonic Mania plays as well. Sonic has a new ability, the Drop Dash, which allows him to immediately drop out of a jump and dash upon hitting the ground, but otherwise, you could draw a direct line between Sonic the Hedgehog 3/Sonic and Knuckles and Sonic Mania. It's a side-scroller that is, ostensibly, a platformer, but it's nothing like its contemporaries. Instead, Sonic and his friends collect rings as they race through each level, looping and

and deadly obstacles from off-screen, whether actually coming from an area not shown at the time or something instantly appearing in front of Sonic. The sound of every ring you've collected exploding out of you when colliding with a hazard is a singularly enraging audio cue, and it's all the more infuriating because frequently, it just doesn't feel fair.

While these are primarily issues for Sonic moving at speed, slowing things down can occasionally pose its own frustration. Sonic has always been terrible with precise platforming. The controls and animation priority are just not up to the demands of pixel-perfect precision (and honestly, some hazards seem to hit Sonic beyond where it seems like they should be able).

For whatever reason, Sonic Mania includes these requisite precise platforming bits, and despite my own sense that they are somewhat more forgiving than in its 16-bit ancestors maybe rings you drop stay on screen longer than they used to - they're still here, and they're still not especially fun. It's ironic that sections requiring twitch reflexes are often the worst parts of Sonic games, but here we are, 26 years later, and it's still true. Somewhat bucking Sonic tradition, the most inventive and fun parts of the game lie within its boss encounters.

isn't unusual, but Sonic Maniareally blows out its most basic gameplay structures, drawing from Sonic games outside of the traditional 2D platformers and digging deep into 16-bit canon. Some encounters aren't platformers at all, some involve battles on the move that go much further than even Sonic CD did, and all of them have enough surprises to keep them engaging. These sections were routinely the parts I most looked forward to.

Sonic Mania doesn't bat 1.000 here either, though. There are a few bosses out of the two dozen or so that fall prey to the same punishing predilection to cheap, unavoidable deaths, which exacerbates the game's frustratingly oldschool retry system. Like any other platformer, Sonic Mania gives you a pool of lives when you start a game, and you gain more through collecting 100 rings or finding them scattered throughout levels. As long as you have more lives, you'll resume at the last checkpoint you dinged when you die, but if you run out, you have to restart the stage you're on from the beginning.

This is marginally better than the original game, which had no continues officially apart from cheat codes. But it still sucks. When some of the less fun, more surprise-murder boss encounters are set at the end of a pair of acts that can take five to six minutes each (or more, if you're trying to find secrets), you can lose a hell of a lot of progress for what feels like no reason at all.

This is especially annoying because Sonic Mania, unlike the 16-bit era Sonics whose pieces it's largely built upon, doesn't need to pad out its length with progress-sapping deaths and restarts; there's plenty to dig through. There were multiple acts I had to race through more than once, and somehow, I always ended up down a completely different path than I had previously. This is something 16-bit Sonic games always did, but never quite on the scale in play here. And you can play as either Sonic and Tails, Sonic alone, Tails alone, or Knuckles, each of whom is able to get to areas of the game inaccessible to the others.— www.polygon.com

SPACEX TO LAUNCH SUPER-COMPUTER TO SPACE

MIAMI: SpaceX is poised to launch an unmanned cargo ship toward the International Space Station yesterday, including a super-computer that could direct astronauts on future deep-space missions. The liftoff of the Falcon 9 rocket, carrying the Dragon cargo ship, is planned for 12:31 pm from Cape Canaveral, Florida. The weather forecast is 70 percent favorable for launch.

The mission is the 12th official trip for SpaceX, which has a \$1.6 billion contract with NASA to supply the astronauts living in orbit over 20 such back-and-forth journeys.

About 10 minutes after launch, the rocket will attempt to make a controlled landing back on solid ground at Cape Canaveral, as part of SpaceX's ongoing effort to re-use rocket components after each take-off. If Monday's launch is delayed for any reason, the next attempt would have to wait until next week, due to a spacewalk planned for Thursday by Russian cosmonauts, who will deploy a series of satellites from the orbiting outpost.

Complicated cargo

The Dragon is packed with 6,400 pounds of supplies, including a sophisticated super-computer made by Hewlett Packard Enterprise (HPE), called The Spaceborne Computer. The goal is to test the computer for one year to see if it can operate in the harsh conditions of space, about the same amount of time as it would take for astronauts to arrive at Mars. As astronauts travel millions of miles away, communications will become increasingly delayed.

Messages from Mars to Earth would be delayed from between four minutes to 24 minutes one-way, depending on the distance between the planets, according to the European Space Agency. "Such a long communication lag would make any onthe-ground exploration challenging and potentially dangerous if astronauts are met with any mission critical scenarios that they're not able to solve themselves," said HPE senior vice president Alain Andreoli in

The new super-computer aims to provide "sophisticated onboard computing resources that are capable of extended periods of uptime," he added, describing the year-long effort as "the first step in that direction." Another experiment on board is designed to help scientists study Parkinson's disease in greater detail in the hopes of finding better treatments for this degenerative disease.

Un-impeded by gravity, protein crystals can grow larger in space, and scientists hope to use this environment to help them understand an important protein in Parkinson's disease, known as Leucine-rich repeat kinase 2 (LRRK2). Until now, this protein has been difficult to study in Earth, according to researchers at the Michael J. Fox Foundation, which developed the research project. Other experiments on board include a stem cell investigation for growing new lung tissue, and equipment for growing vegetables in space.—AFP





and PagodaWest games. The result is Sonic Mania, a game that feels slavishly, almost fetishistically devoted to the old-school branch of Sonic gameplay and design. As a result, Sonic Mania feels like the series' Genesis-period ideas taken to logical extremes, and then some. But in its fixation on making a perfect recreation of '90s-era Sonic, some of the series' more egregious recurring problems remain present - with some modern quality-of-life elements nowhere to be found. Sonic Mania opens as Dr. Eggman once again steals a collection of powerful gems called Chaos Emeralds, and it's up to Sonic, constant companion Tails the Fox and frenemy Knuckles the Echidna to get them back and defeat Eggman until ... well, whenever Sega rolls this whole thing out again.

If you've played any of the Genesis Sonic titles, Sonic Mania is going to look and feel familiar. No, really. Sonic Mania looks achingly familiar, to the point where I'm not clear

backtracking at speeds that seem too fast for even the game's camera to keep up.

That feeling of barely controlled speed is Sonic's original schtick, and it's leveraged for everything it's worth here. Levels feel much bigger than they were in the Genesis games, with many, many more paths to barrel down, even as many enemies and bits of scenery hit your sense of nostalgia like a bucket of ice. When it's working, this speed is exhilarating, and remarkably, no other game has ever managed to capture the same lightning in a bottle that Sonic did.

Sonic Mania, more than any Sega-led project of the last 20 years, feels exactly the way I remember the original trilogy. As I made my way through the revamped, re-imagined Green Hill Zone that starts the game, it was hard not to feel a little giddy - could someone have made a Sonic that feels as good as I remembered the originals feeling? As it turns out, Sonic Mania is maybe too faithful. Sonic & co. are capable of incredible speed, it's true, but there's a sluggishness as they work their way toward it. It's not just stopping that takes a long time, which, hey, at least that makes sense. There's a windup to just about everything, from movement to jumping.

This windup time was always something that made Sonic feel sloppier than his industry arch-rivals, and it's in full effect here. On its own, it would be moderately irritating, but it's coupled with level design that doesn't seem to have learned much about the kinds of obstacles the series used that were least suited to the tools available. The chief example of this is surprise appearances and attacks from enemies

NO LONGER KING OF THE JUNGLE: NEW FUND TO AID AFRICA'S LIONS

DAKAR: Senegal's Niokolo-Koba National Park is home to fewer than 50 lions after years of poaching decimated not only them but also their prey. Small patches of lion skin are sold at local fetish markets for \$10, and their bones have a thriving market in Asia. Sightings have become so rare that it once took researchers conducting a lion survey in the area two months before they spotted one of the big cats. Conservationists, however, believe the park could one day rebound.

"This landscape is still in fantastic shape," said Philipp Henschel, West and Central Africa regional director for the lion program at Panthera, a global wild cat conservation organization. "This area could potentially, if well protected, harbor between 400 and 500 lions." A \$150,000 grant from a fund launched this week by the Wildlife Conservation Network and The Leonardo DiCaprio Foundation is aimed at better equipping Niokolo-Koba's park rangers for those efforts.

The Lion Recovery Fund is initially providing \$800,000 toward bolstering lions' habitat across the continent, from Senegal in the west to Tanzania in the east as well as Zambia and Malawi in southern Africa. "Lions in Africa are facing a whole range of human threats that are increasing in scope as the human and livestock populations grow," said Peter Lindsey, conservation initiatives director for the Wildlife Conservation Network.

Many wildlife areas "are really suffering from a lack of funding and resources," he said. The situation is particularly dire in West Africa, where the lion sub-species has been classified as "critically endangered." Only about 400 lions remain there out of the total 20,000 worldwide, Henschel said. About 90 percent of those in West Africa are in a protected area that spans parts of Benin, Burkina Faso and Niger. Startup support for the Lion Recovery Fund came from The Leonardo DiCaprio Foundation, which previously has partnered on elephant conservation issues, Lindsey said. They are pledging that 100 percent of donations to the fund will go directly toward work on the ground, without overhead costs. —AP

2016 WEATHER: EXTREME AND ANYTHING BUT NORMAL

WASHINGTON: Last year's global weather was far more extreme or record-breaking than anything approaching normal, according to a new report. The US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration on Thursday released its annual checkup of the Earth, highlighting numerous records including hottest year, highest sea level, and lowest sea ice in the Arctic and Antarctica.

The 299-page report, written by scientists around the world and published in the Bulletin of the American Meteorological Society, shows that 2016 was "very extreme and it is a cause for concern," said co-editor Jessica Blunden, a NOAA climate scientist. Researchers called it a clear signal of human-caused climate change. A record large El Nino, the warming of the central Pacific that changes weather worldwide, was also a big factor in last year's wild weather.

"2016 will be forever etched in my brain as the year we crossed a new threshold of climate change - one that gave us a grim glimpse into our future," said Georgia Tech climate scientist Kim Cobb, who had no role in the report. Scientists examined dozens of key climate measures and found: At any given time, nearly one-eighth of the world's land mass was in severe drought. That's far higher than normal and "one of the worst years for drought," said report co-author Robert Dunn of the United Kingdom Met Office.

Extreme weather was everywhere. Giant downpours were up. Heat waves struck all over the globe, including a nasty one in India. Extreme weather contributed to a gigantic wildfire in Canada. Global sea level rose another quarter of an inch (3.4 millimeters) for the sixth straight year of record high sea levels.

There were 93 tropical cyclones across the globe, 13 percent more than normal. That included Hurricane Matthew that killed about 1,000 people in Haiti. The world's glaciers shrank - for the 37th year in a row - by an average of about 3 feet. Greenland's ice sheet in 2016 lost 341 billion tons of ice (310 billion metric tons). It has lost 4400 billion tons (4000 billion metric tons of ice since 2002.

"2016 was a year in the Arctic like we've never seen before," said NOAA Arctic research chief Jeremy Mathis, who called it "a clear and more pronounced signal of warming than in any other year on record." Many of the findings have been previously released, including that 2016 was the hottest year on record for the third consecutive year. A separate study based on modeling and weather patterns shows three hot years in a row is close to impossible to be a natural coincidence. —AP

SCIENCE SAYS: FAST-MELTING ICE SIGN OF BAD GLOBAL WARMING

'Melting of the Arctic will come to haunt us all'

WASHINGTON: One of the coldest places on Earth is so hot it's melting. Glaciers, sea ice and a massive ice sheet in the Arctic are thawing from toasty air above and warm water below. The northern polar region is heating up twice as fast as the rest of the planet and that's setting off alarm bells. "The melting of the Arctic will come to haunt us all," said German climate scientist Stefan Rahmstorf. While global leaders set a goal of preventing 2 degrees Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit) of manmade warming since pre-industrial times, the Arctic has already hit that dangerous mark. Last year, the Arctic Circle was about 3.6 degrees (6.5 degrees Fahrenheit) warmer than normal.

Causes of warming

Earth is getting hotter because of the buildup of heat-trapping gases spewed into the air by the burning of coal, oil and natural gas, according to decades of peerreviewed research. Scientists have long predicted the Arctic would warm first and faster than the rest of the globe. Real-time measurements are proving them right.

The Arctic is mostly ocean covered with a layer of ice; changes from ice to water often kick in a cycle that contributes to global warming. Sea ice is white and it reflects the sun's heat back into space. But when it melts, it's replaced with dark ocean that strongly absorbs it, said former NASA chief scientist Waleed Abdalati, who heads the environmental research program at the University of Colorado.

That heat gets transferred back up to the atmosphere in the fall and winter. As that happens, water vapor - a greenhouse gas - hangs around, trapping more heat. More clouds form around that time, also acting as a blanket, said Mark Serreze. director of the National Snow and Ice Data Center in Boulder, Colorado.

Winter is coming

Winter is crucial. Three times in the past two cold seasons, air temperatures near the North Pole were near or even a shade above freezing. That's about 50 degrees warmer than it should be. From last November through February, Barrow, Alaska - the northernmost U.S. city - was 7 warmer than the 20th century average, and much of the Atlantic Arctic off Norway and Greenland was as hot.

degrees Celsius (13 degrees Fahrenheit)

Warm winters weaken sea ice, which floats on the ocean surface. It's supposed to recover, spread more across the Arctic and get thicker in the winter so it can withstand the warmth of the summer. But a warmer winter means less protection when the heat hits. In September 2016, the time of year the spread of ice across the Arctic is at its lowest, Arctic sea ice was the second lowest day on record, about 40 percent below the lowest day measured in 1979 when satellite records started. Between those two days 37 years apart, the Arctic lost enough sea ice to cover Alaska, Texas and California combined. Then it didn't grow back that much this winter, setting record low amounts from November through March, when sea ice reaches its peak spread.

Beyond the Arctic

Of all the global warming warning signs in the Arctic, "it is the sea ice that is screaming the loudest," Serreze said. That's a problem because a growing body of studies connects dwindling sea ice to wild weather. The reduced winter sea ice interacts with warmer oceans to change conditions in the air that then triggers a potent noticeable shift in the jet stream, the giant atmospheric river that controls much of our weather, said Rutgers University climate scientist Jennifer Francis. This theory is still debated by scientists, but increasingly more researchers are agreeing with Francis.

It's not just sea ice on the decline. Glaciers in the Arctic are shrinking. And the massive Greenland ice sheet is slowly but steadily melting and that can add a big dose to sea level rise. Since 2002, it has lost 4,400 billion tons (4,000 billion metric tons) of ice. Then there's the Arctic carbon bomb. Carbon dioxide and methane which traps even more heat - are stuck in the permafrost in places like Alaska and Siberia. "Roast the Arctic and you create a mess everywhere on Earth," said Princeton University climate scientist Michael Oppenheimer. —AP

REWARD OFFERED TO CATCH FISH DUMPER

RENO, Nevada: Nevada game wardens who spend most of their time hunting down big-game poachers are focusing on a serious threat to nature in a lake: An invasive fish species that eats all the other fish prized by anglers and then turns cannibalistic. The Nevada Department of Wildlife is offering a \$10,000 reward to help nab the culprit who apparently dumped Northern pike in Comins Lake, a popular fishing spot surrounded by mountains near Great Basin National Park.

By all accounts, Comins Lake was well on its way to recovery after the state restocked the fishery with largemouth bass, brown and rainbow trout in 2015. But the invading Northern Pike were discovered again last month by a fisherman who caught one and called state wildlife

officials. Five more have been confirmed since then.

"This malicious and illegal act seriously endangers our effort to restore this important fishery," said Jon Sjoberg, chief of fisheries for the Nevada Department of Wildlife. "The people illegally introducing pike are destroying a fishery, not creating a new one." Chief Game Warden Tyler Turnipseed announced the reward this week. "We intend to find who did it," he said. Northern pike may not sound as scary as piranhas or the Asian swamp eel - two of the other half-dozen fish that Nevada law singles out as invasive, injurious aquatic species.

But with its long, needle-sharp teeth, the voracious predator that sometimes grows longer than 4 feet (1.2 meters) can wipe out an entire fishery. "They eat all the

trout we put in there," Edwin Lyngar, spokesman for the state wildlife agency, said in an interview Friday. "Then they eat all the other fish they can find, and then they start to eat each other." The remote eastern Nevada lake near Utah border covers about two-thirds of a square mile and draws numerous anglers. "It brings tremendous economic activity to this part of the state," Lyngar said. "Years ago, people came from all over the world to fish that lake."

At its peak in 2004, the lake logged 35,000 "angler user days" and generated more than \$2 million for the local economy as the fourth-most visited fishery in the state behind Lake Mead, Lake Mohave and the Truckee River, which flows out of Lake Tahoe through downtown Reno. —AP

CHICKEN VELOUTE STEW RECIPE and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes

■his "composed" stew isn't just a jumble of ingredients cooked together. Instead, each vegetable is added separately so they lightly poach in the rich, thick sauce and retain their texture.

Ingredients

- 4 chicken wings 100g butter 4 chicken thighs
- 2 cups button mushrooms,
- 1 brown onion, sliced 1/2 cup flour 11/2 litres chicken stock
- 2 bay leaves 4 sprigs thyme
- 1/2 small savoy cabbage, divided into two wedges
- 3 carrots, peeled and cut into thirds

1/2 head broccoli, separated into florets a handful of green beans, tailed

100ml pouring cream

Method

1. Joint the chicken wings and put the wing tips to one side - they're not needed in this dish. Heat a little of the butter in a large, wide, heavy-lidded saucepan. Fry the chicken thighs and wings until well browned on the outside but not yet cooked through. Remove from the pan and set aside.


2. In the same pan, fry the mushrooms until well browned. remove from the pan and set aside. Then add the onion and remaining butter and cook until the onions soften. Add the flour until a roux forms. Add chicken stock a little at a time, stirring constantly to remove any lumps from the roux until you have a thick sauce. Season to taste with salt and white pepper. Add the bay leaves, thyme, cabbage wedges and carrots, reduce the heat to a simmer, then cover and cook for 20 minutes.

3. Slice the chicken thighs and add with the wings to one section of the pot. Add the mushrooms to another section. Simmer for 5 minutes, then add the broccoli and beans in their own sections. Simmer for a further minute, then taste and adjust for seasoning again (it will likely need a little more salt). Pour the cream over the stew and serve.







'Ingrid Goes West' looks at social media's dark side

title character in "Ingrid Goes West," there is no question, and perhaps no distinction. Powered by Aubrey Plaza's searing performance, director and cowriter Matt Spicer's feature debut explores such a dark side of social media obsession, it's hard to consider it satire. It's a story about young women who find validation in likes and followers, who equate social media experiences with real-life ones.

Like so many millennials, Ingrid (Plaza) is an Instagram junkie. Her phone is always in hand, a portal to all that is #perfect and #blessed. Any free moment is spent scrolling through photos. The double-thumb-tap she uses to "like" images is as instinctive as blinking. But she's also obsessive and mentally unstable. She once crashed a wedding and attacked the bride after fixating on her expertly curated Instagram profile.

Flush with cash after her mother dies, Ingrid moves to Los Angeles to be near her latest social media obsession: Blonde, beautiful Taylor Sloane (Elizabeth Olsen), whose life on Instagram looks like a chic California magazine captioned with literary quotes and hashtags like #weekendvibes. Ingrid styles her hair like Taylor's. She eats at her favorite breakfast spot. She buys the purse Taylor posted about. Then she works out a way to meet the Instagram star so they can be friends.

Olsen is pitch perfect as sunny, superficial Taylor, who says everything is "the best" and has no qualms about asking a gas station attendant to lay on the ground to snap a perfectly-framed social media pic. The screenplay by Spicer and co-writer David Branson Smith looks at how Taylor's appetite for admiration

uick, what's more important: might allow for a friend like Ingrid - her social media or real life? For the sycophantic fawning feeds right into Taylor's million-follower ego.

Plaza disappears into the unhinged Ingrid, a character exciting in her sheer unlikeability. She lies and steals to get what she wants. She exploits trust and kindness. But she brims with a deep human fear of inadequacy, one she hopes internet popularity might remedy. Plaza brings a vulnerability and desperation to Ingrid that makes her relatable. She's obsessive and unstable, but she just wants to be liked, online or any-

O'Shea Jackson plays Ingrid's landlord/neighbor/admirer Dan, this story's version of the manic pixie dream girl. Though Jackson gets to show off his sparkling smile more here than in "Straight Outta Compton," his character exists to be Ingrid's savior and moral foil. "Ingrid Goes West" has fun with some social media tropes and Southern California tendencies, but it feels less like a satire than a cautionary tale, for both the envious and the envied. It dips into rich territory by examining the covetousness social media inspires, not just for things, but for attention. Still, even someone with millions of followers can feel lonely or

Taylor and Ingrid may approach Instagram from opposite sides, but both live in a world where "likes" have tremendous value. Love is in the air on India's first LGBT radio show

utspoken Indian gay rights activist Harish lyer is used to fighting for equal rights but over the last month he has turned into a messenger of love. He is the host of "Gaydio", the first radio show dedicated to lesbian, gay, bi-sexual and transgender (LGBT) issues in India, where homosexuality is a taboo and gay sex can be punished with up to 10 years in jail. "As an activist, it is in my DNA to stand up for a cause," Iyer, 38, told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

"You hear heart-warming love stories during your activism, but you are busy being the savior. But on this show, I look at the softer side." India's penal code bans "sex against the order of nature", which is widely interpreted as homosexual sex, and transgender people face widespread discrimination even though the Supreme Court has enshrined a person's right to identify as transgender.

The weekly show on commercial radio channel Ishq, which means love in Urdu, was launched in mid-July and is aired every Sunday in the cities of Mumbai, New Delhi and Kolkata. Iyer's guests on the two-hour Sunday show included a Sikh-Muslim male couple who spoke about how they met, their coming-out experience and still going strong after 12 years. In another episode, a

mother spoke with her son's ex-boyfriend and in the latest airing, a heterosexual man and his transgender wife shared their story.

lyer, who hit headlines in 2015 when his mother posted a "groom wanted" matrimonial advertisement in a leading English-language newspaper, said people on his show have shared their stories openly. "The unique religion, caste, gender and familial bonds in these stories are part of the narrative," lyer said. There is no official data on the LGBT population in India, but the government estimates there are 2.5 million gay people, reflecting those who have declared

their sexuality to the health ministry. Campaigners say real numbers are far higher as many individuals conceal their identity fearing discrimination in a country where most marriages still take place within the boundaries of caste and religion. Shivangini Jajoria, national operations head at Ishq, said the radio station wants to break down boundaries and feature all kind of relationships. "When the Muslim and Sikh couple shared their coming out story, it made it easier for others to come out," said Jajoria. "People are also understanding the LGBTQ community better through these stories."-Reuters

No 'Game of Thrones' in latest HBO hacker leak

ackers continue to pester HBO, but didn't release any material related to the network's hit show "Game of Thrones" in their latest leak. The hackers, who broke into HBO's computer network and have been doling out stolen information for the past several weeks, released more unaired episodes, including several of the highly anticipated return of "Curb Your Enthusiasm," which debuts in October.

The latest dump includes Sunday night's episode of "Insecure," another popular show, and what appear to be episodes of other lower-profile shows, including "Ballers," the unaired shows "Barry" and "The Deuce," a comedy special and other programming. The network acknowledged the hack in late July, and the thieves have been dribbling out stolen video and documents since then while demanding a multimillion-dollar ransom.

They have leaked "Game of Thrones" scripts, sensitive internal documents like job offer letters and a month's worth of emails from a programming executive. But the intrusion has so far fallen well short of the chaos inflicted on Sony when the studio was hacked in 2014. Still, the criminals may be holding on to more damaging data - both intellectual property, like unaired programming, and sensitive personal information of HBO employees - that they can use as leverage to try to get money from HBO, said Gartner analyst Avivah

"It's kind of like kidnap and ransom and torture," she said. "Eventually HBO may have to give in." In an emailed statement Sunday, HBO said it's "not going to participate" in what it described as attempts to generate attention by dropping "bits and pieces of stolen information." The company added that it was not in communication with the hackers. It has said previously that it doesn't believe its email system as a whole was breached. — AP

Britain's **Big Ben** to fall silent for four years

silent for four years from next week as conservation work is carried out on the famous 19th century bell in a clock tower next to the Houses of Parliament. "Big Ben crucial conservation project," Steve Jaggs, whose official title is "Keeper of the Great Clock", said in a parliament statement yesterday. "This essential program of works will safeguard the clock on a long term basis, as well as protecting and preserving its homethe Elizabeth Tower," he said.

It will be the longest period that Big Ben, whose bongs are familiar to many people around the world because of their use in BBC radio and television broadcasts, has been silent in its 157-year history. The Great Bell, popularly called Big Ben, weighs 13.7 tons and strikes every hour to the note of E. Four smaller bells also chime every 15 minutes. The last bong before the refurbishment will be at 12 pm on August 21, the statement said. The clock will still tell the time silently until

ritain's much-loved Big Ben will fall 2021 and the chimes will continue to be rung on important occasions such as New Year's

The Elizabeth Tower, which is 96 meters high, is the most photographed building in falling silent is a significant milestone in this Britain. The tower itself is commonly referred to as Big Ben even though the name applies only to the bell. The clock's cogs and hands as well as the four dials will be removed, cleaned up and repaired as part of the work. The project's cost was estimated last year at £29 million (31.9 million euros, \$37.7 million). Because the clock mechanism will be temporarily out of action, a modern electric motor will drive the clock hands until the clock is reinstated.

Parliament also said that the clock's faces would have to be covered up while they are being repaired. "However, to ensure that the public are still able to set their watches by this most important of time pieces, one working clock face will remain visible at all times throughout the works," it said. — AP

Book Review



'A Stranger in the House' has strong plot

n her second thriller, Shari Lapena poses the question: How well do you know your spouse? It's not exactly a new story device, but Lapena's fresh approach makes it seem original in "A Stranger in the House." While the novel is plot-heavy, the characters are more sketches than fully fleshed-out people. No character is likable or worth rooting for, but the redemption is that Lapena makes them interesting, keeping the reader invested in what happens next.

Karen Krupp is left with a bad concussion after crashing her car into a pole while fleeing from an abandoned restaurant in a sketchy neighborhood in a town in upstate New York. She claims she has no memory of what happened, and her doctors acknowledge that this could happen, but add that she might regain her memory. Police surmise that Karen may have something to do with a man found shot to death in the empty restaurant.

Karen's husband, Tom, is at a loss at what to believe. Karen's accident, and the fact that she left that night without her purse or cellphone, are out of character for his normally calm, organized wife. Tom begins to wonder just how well he knows Karen. She never talks about her background and her family, and she appears to have only one friend, Brigid Cruikshank, who lives across the street.

But Brigid is hardly the caring friend, spending most of her day in front of her living room window watching the comings and goings of the Krupps, consumed with jealousy over their life. Lapena keeps the well-developed twists churning, with each a surprise notch in this ever-evolving plot, and she continues this skillful storytelling until the stunning twist at the end. But it's hard to connect with the cold Karen, the naive, almost vapid Tom or the creepy Brigid.

Lapena's excellent debut, "The Couple Next Door," melded plot with character for a unique look at a missing child case. In "A Stranger in the House," Lapena's characters are indeed strangers, forgettable as soon as the reader has finished. But the strong plot of "A Stranger in the House" is quite memorable. — AP



'I Know a Secret' unfolds in unexpected ways

ess Gerritsen brings back Boston homicide detective Jane Rizzoli and medical examiner Maura Isles to tackle another baffling mystery in "I Know a Secret: a Rizzoli & Isles Novel," weaving a thriller that slowly unfolds in unexpected ways. Rizzoli and Isles feel like real people, and readers who are fans of either the book series or the former TV show know there's an emotional angle to the proceedings and care about everything that happens to the duo.

In "I Know a Secret," a woman in her early twenties who worked on independent and low-budget horror films is murdered in her bed. When another body shows up - a man around the same age - Isles realizes there must be a connection. The evidence suggests otherwise, but Rizzoli knows to trust Isles' instincts. They soon learn that the two victims knew each other when they were children and went to the same after-

The three people who ran it were prosecuted and imprisoned for doing horrible things to the children in their care. Rizzoli and Isles realize that one of them has recently been released from jail. "I Know a Secret" becomes a race to protect the remaining children who testified all those years ago from suffering a similar fate. And how do the crimes tie into the gruesome death of martyred saints? Gerritsen writes effortlessly, and this is another stellar entry in the series. — AP

Annabelle scares up \$35m, jolting sleepy box office

■he "Conjuring" spinoff "Annabelle: Creation" scared up an estimated \$35 million in North American theaters over the weekend, making it easily the top film and giving the lagging August box office a shot in the arm. The opening came close to matching the film's predecessor, "Annabelle," which opened with \$37.1 million in October 2014. Warner Bros. could celebrate not only the month's biggest debut but also having the week's top two films. Christopher Nolan's "Dunkirk" followed in second with \$11.4 million in its fourth weekend, according to studio estimates Sunday.

Even amid an especially weak August, the well-reviewed horror sequel and modestly budgeted "Annabelle: Creation" found eager audiences. "That we were able to do \$35 million in what is a very sluggish marketplace was very impressive," said Jeffrey Goldstein, Warner Bros.' distribution chief. "We all know that moviegoing begets moviegoing and right now it's a dip in the content overall." The film, the third to spiral out of 2013's "The Conjuring," cost only about \$15 million to make.

More sequels and spinoffs are being developed in what has become for Warner Bros. a steadily profitable horror franchise bent on old-school frights. The "Annabelle" offshoot centers on a possessed doll. Last week's top film, the poorly received Stephen King adaptation "The Dark Tower," slid dramatically. The Sony Pictures release, starring Idris Elba and Matthew McConaughey, toppled nearly 60 percent on its second weekend with an estimated \$7.9 million.

The week's other new entry, the Open Road animated release "Nut Job 2: Nutty by Nature," edged just above "The Dark Tower" with \$8.9 million. That was well below the 2014 debut of the original, "The Nut Job," which opened with \$19.4 million. But the solid returns for "Annabelle: Creation" did little to counter the box-office slide. The box office was down 31.6 percent from the same weekend last year, when "Suicide



Squad" was No. 1 despite brutal reviews and Seth Rogen's "Sausage Party" opened.

The summer altogether is down 12.4 percent from last year, according to comScore. "This is a great weekend to be a really scary doll and Warner Bros., but for everyone else, it's just plain scary," said Paul Dergarabedian, senior media analyst for comScore. "It proves the horror genre is alive and well." Some of July's bright spots, however, have continued into August. The summer's top comedy, "Girls Trip," will soon sur-

pass \$100 million domestically.

The movie, starring Jada Pinkett Smith and Queen Latifah, took in \$6.5 million in its fourth week to bring its cumulative total to \$97.2 million. It may end up doubling the gross of its closest summer comedy competition: the starrier and pricey "Baywatch" (\$58.1 million in its entire run). In limited release, the A24 crime thriller "Good Time," starring Robert Pattinson, debuted with a robust \$34,000 per-screen average on four screens. That was bettered, though, by the \$47,000 screenaverage of Neon's "Ingrid Goes West," with Aubrey Plaza, on three screens. Both films expand in coming weeks.

The actor and director was married to actress Renee Taylor, who credited his doctors for prolonging his life so he could receive a lifetime achievement award at the Night of 100 Stars for the Actors' Fund of America on Feb 26. "He had a beautiful life," Taylor said in a statement.

Born Dec. 30, 1934, Bologna was a native to Brooklyn, New York. After he graduated from Brown University with a degree in art history, Bologna served in the

Marines. Bologna and Taylor married in 1965. "Joe was a loveable man, a kind soul, a good friend and always a pleasure to be with," Sherman said. Bologna was nominated for an Oscar in 1971 for best adapted screenplay for "Lovers and Other Strangers." He won an Emmy in 1973. He had a string of television appearances, but he was best known for the 1982 comedy "My Favorite Year." Bologna was a voice actor for the 2006 animated film "Ice Age: The Meltdown" and had a role in the 1999 Adam Sandler comedy "Big Daddy." — AP

In a weak summer at the box office, bright spots abound

n their face, the numbers are grim. Movie icket sales in North America are running roughly half a billion dollars behind last summer's box office, making this one of lowestgrossing summers in years. The 12.4 percent downturn comes at a critical juncture for Hollywood, with constantly swirling fears about the impact of streaming, television and the bazillion other entertainment options out there. AMC, the largest theater chain in the United States, saw its stock price tank recently partly because of slow sales and its forecast for "a very challenging" third quarter.

And yet much of the story at the multiplex this summer has been very positive. Few of the movies that won strong reviews and a warm reception from moviegoers didn't also perform well at the box office. With few exceptions, when the studios supfickle. The stuff they liked, they really liked," said Jeffrey Goldstein, distribution chief for Warner Bros. "The movies that were well received were rewarded with good holds." All but three of the No.1 films this summer were certified fresh on Rotten Tomatoes, including this past weekend's top film, the horror seguel "Annabelle: Creation." "The irony is, it was one of the best summers to be a moviegoer, if not a theater operator," said Paul Dergarabedian, senior media analyst for comScore.

"When I look at movies like 'Guardians 2,' 'Wonder Woman,' 'War for the Planet of the Apes,' 'Spider-Man: Homecoming,' 'The Big Sick,' 'Detroit,' 'Baby Driver,' 'Dunkirk,' 'Wind River,' I have to say it's been a great time as a moviegoer. "This is sort of: It was the best of times, it was the worst of times," said Dergarabedian. You could easily add to that list, too. Hollywood system, was the kind of pricey auteurdriven overreach that today's corporate-driven studios have largely snuffed out. So what's the problem? Where's the missing \$500 million? (That's about the gap left by this summer's overall gross of \$3.4 billion.) There are two significant drains on this summer's totals. One is the lack of any late-summer blockbuster on the schedule. Before Hollywood's summer runs out on Labor Day weekend, there will be no "Suicide Squad," "Straight Outta Compton" or "Guardians of the Galaxy" (all recent August releases) to mount a comeback.

More significant are a trio of underperforming franchise entries. Paramount's fifth "Transformers" film, Disney's fifth "Pirates of the Caribbean" and Universal's latest try at "The Mummy," all underperformed. All, not coincidentally, were slammed by critics as either franchises running on fumes or, in the case of "The Mummy," a desperate attempt to create one. Each of these titles, to varying degrees, mitigated their losses with better performances overseas. Each made about 80 percent of its worldwide grosses abroad.

The "Pirates" installment, "Dead Men Tell No Tales," debuted in China and pulled in \$614 million internationally. "Transformers: The Last Knight," grossed \$228.8 million in China, the most of any American movie this summer. International box office altogether is up 3.8 percent this year, according to comScore, an increase of about \$600 million. But those movies - along with muted business for "War for the Planet of the Apes" and "Alien: Covenant" - proved that the franchise fatigue that affected last summer has had a sequel of its own in

While not quite the drumbeat of last summer when a dozen sequels failed to outshine their predecessors, moviegoers continue to sniff out the less inspired retreads of familiar brands. "There have been some big misfires and costly misfires this season," said Adrian Smith, president of domestic distribution for Sony. "The consumer wants unique, fresh and original content. They don't want tired, stale properties. I think that's just their way of speaking out." That continues to pose a potentially existential threat to modern Hollywood, which is virtually run on franchise-building and mining intellectual prop-

But if "Spider-Man" can be rebooted every five years and still churn out \$700 million in worldwide box office, it shows that "fresh" doesn't necessarily mean "new." What may be changing, though, is the importance of the summer season altogether. Several of the year's biggest films came in its first few months, including "Beauty and the Beast," "Get Out" and "The Fate of the Furious." The year as a whole is running 4.2 percent behind last year - not as yawning as the summer deficit but still a sizable gap large enough to stoke fears for the industry.

But several almost sure-fire blockbusters await in the fall: "Thor: Ragnarok," "Justice League" and "The Last Jedi." Had just one of them preferred warmer temperatures, the summer box office might have looked quite different. — AP

Warner Bros. later gave the summer an honest-togoodness Oscar contender in July: Christopher Nolan's World War II epic "Dunkirk."

On Friday, Oscar-winner Steven Soderbergh will trot out his return to movie directing, the heist film "Logan Lucky," with Channing Tatum. 

Pratt drops in at TEEN CHOICE Awards but Cyrus a no-show

■he Teen Choice Awards, always a bubble of teenage celebration, took time out during Sunday night's ceremony to consider the world its young audience will inherit. Hashtags, surfboards and loud shrieks dominated the Teen Choice Awards, as usual, with YouTube star Jake Paul presiding over a show designed to be tweeted, Snapchatted and put on Instagram. But with the two-hour broadcast coming a day after the violence at a rally of white nationalists in Charlottesville, Virginia, some winners pleaded for teen viewers to do better than their elders.

"With all the injustice and the hatred and everything that's happened not only in the world but in our country right now, I need for you young people, I need you guys to be educated. I need you to listen. I need you to pay attention," said "Spider-Man: Homecoming" actress Zendaya, accepting an award for best summer movie actress. "You are the future presidents, the future senators," she added, clutching the show's trademark surfboard award. "You guys are the ones who are going to make this world better."

The music performance-stuffed show, broadcast live on Fox from Los Angeles, followed a three-hour "Teen Fest" concert in downtown Los Angeles that was streamed on YouTube. Miley Cyrus, an 18-time Teen Choice award winner, was to receive the ceremony's highest honor, the Ultimate Choice Award. But she was announced as a last-minute cancellation early in the ceremony. "I know," said presenter Victoria Justice. "It's a bummer." (Cyrus apologized on Twitter saying she created "an unrealistic schedule for myself.")

Many of the other biggest names either sent video acceptances (Bruno Mars, Gal Gadot) or were merely announced as winners (Beyonce, Zac Efron, Ariana Grande). One notable exception was Chris Pratt, who dropped by to accept his two movie awards. Pratt and his wife, Anna Farris, recently announced their separation. That still left many teen idols for the crowd to cheer, including the cast of the CW drama series "Riverdale" (winner of seven awards) and the group Fifth Harmony, the winner of best music group and song.

"In light of recent events, we just wanted to say to all of the young ones at home watching, no matter who you are, where you come from or what you look like, you are beautiful and you are important," said the group's Lauren Jauregui. "So keep



spreading love and positivity." The prominent role for Paul was a big moment for him, too. In late July Paul departed the Disney Channel series "Bizaardvark" after reports that he was feuding with his West Hollywood, California, neighbors.

"The past few months have humbled me quite a bit. I had to be more mindful of my words and actions and how they impact others," said Paul while accepting his own pair of awards for best YouTuber and web star. "The next step for me is to forget all the bad press, drama, negativity." Rock band Maroon 5 was honored with the decade award. Other winners included Dwayne Johnson for "Moana," Lucy Hale for "Pretty Little Liars" and Ed Sheeran for best male song. — AP





Yielding neither an essence nor an absolute, its bewitching fragrance has nonetheless been masterfully recreated by the olfactory memory of Alberto Morillas. He conceived it as a flower with airy freshness and addictive, explosive accents. By combining the sweetness of the Peony with the power of patchouli, he has created an aroma recognizable to thousands, Bulgari's emblematic chypre.

Night blooming jasmine

The Master Perfumer has chosen to stamp Goldea, The Roman Night with the rounder, sweeter and floral notes of this rarest of all jasmines - jasmine sambac from China.To accentuate the rich personality of jasmine and capture its allencompassing beauty, Alberto Morillas chose the rarely-used but traditional method of infusion. Floral infusions are regarded as the vintage method of perfume making, for their authenticity and care.

The technique uses gentle extraction by a traditional maceration of jasmine flowers in alcohol, which is both time-consuming and costly. After an invaluable period in which the blooms are macerated in ethyl alcohol, the Jasmine flowers unleash their secrets while preserving the purest respect for the raw material. In this meticulous manner, a night-blooming Jasmine delivers its olfactory radiance under the lunar star, while it's most feminine, attractive and bewitching aspects were majestically captured by the Master Perfumer.

Tuberose absolute

Symbol of sensuality, both classic and modern, tuberose is the star jewel of all perfumers. Alberto Morillas adores its scandalous reputation and extravagant signature that offers a delicate, yet powerfully "narcotic" floral aroma. The tuberose that gives Goldea, The Roman Night its trademark signature is grown and harvested in southeast India.

Elegant and majestic, dainty yet demanding, tuberose is one of the most sought-after fragrances in perfumery. This

goddess of perfume known as the "evening gueen" has its scent intensifying at nightfall. Harvested at dawn, tuberose blossoms are picked as buds to instill their wide olfactory spectrum into the very heart of their absolute. Essential oil of tuberose is one of the rarest and most expensive in the world, requiring 5 tons of buds per 1 kg of absolute.

Black musk

Powerful and sensual, black musk is able to exude its amber and woody notes to become one with the skin, as it displays a bold, mysterious character. Devising a round, sensual, almost carnal note, the Master Perfumer has reinvented the myth of Tonkin musk. He created a black musk with a deep, magnetic trail to infuse the skin with radiant, sensual desire. This enhanced black musk possesses a powerful, addictive aura that adds a bolder, more mysterious sensuality to the fragrance.

Patchouli heart

19th century European women discovered patchouli's power of attraction on large cashmere shawls imported from India, wrapped in patchouli leaves. The living plant emits no scent, the magic of patchouli comes to light when its dry leaves release an intensely woody fragrance.. Thanks to an innovative technique, Alberto Morillas has captured the portion of patchouli referred to as the "patchouli heart" that contains pure, crystalline, clear and explosive notes.

Bewitching bottle

Hypnotic and symbolic, its scales winding around the bottle top Bulgari's Serpenti is the enchanting spirit animal of the Goldea collection. Representing seduction and life, the sinewy serpent was a royal sign of strength for ancient queens. Project aims to attract tourists to remote Albanian villages

igh in the mountains of southern Albania, a bone-jarring drive along a rough track with switchbacks frequented more by goats than by cars leads to a cluster of small villages where time appears to have stood still for decades. Sheep's milk is still carried to the local cheesemaker by donkey. Elderly villagers hike into the mountains to collect fistfuls of wild oregano and other herbs. Old rituals of lighting candles to honor ancient, gnarled, sacred oaks are kept alive, although no one who practices them seems to know why or how they came about.

Strung out along a sheer cliff behind an old, crumbled fortress, the village of Nivica is unknown to many even in Albania. But an ambitious project is aiming to open it up to the outside world and to tourists wanting to discover the spectacular natural beauty and rural way of life of the more isolated parts of the country. "We are doing a pilot project on the concept of how to connect rural communities very close to the coastline but (which have) never been helped by coastline tourism," said Auron Tare, who heads Albania's National Coastline Agency and is leading the project in Nivica. The area's attractions are many. Crystal-clear streams run through sheer canyons and gorges slicing through the landscape. Small stone Ottomanera bridges still arch over gullies, untouched for centuries. At sunset, shepherds drive their flocks through the fields to small corrals for milking. And like everything in the Balkans, the region is steeped in history.

"Apart from the landscape, the reason to come here is because of the stories. This is a place where Roman troops traveled, this is a place where Normans traveled, this is a place where Ottomans traveled. World War I, World War II. There are many stories to be connected to this area," Tare said.

"Plus the wonderful landscape, and also the untouched life. Here you see people milking their sheep and their goats as they did 4,000 years ago. You see people in their pastoral daily life, which is extremely attractive to people who have lost that heritage, and you would come here and find that spiritual enrichment in your life." For now, visitors are mainly young backpackers from European countries hiking along Albania's ancient trails and camping in a

field just outside the village. Tare says about 150 tourists visited the village over the past month, mainly from the Czech Republic, drawn by comments on social media from a team of Czechs who have been working on marking centuries-old paths as hiking trails.

Local culture

The area is still far off the beaten track; many of those living on the coast just over the other side of the mountains have never even heard of Nivica. "This village, we can say that it is deeply (hidden) in the mountain," said Lorena Sinatrakaj, a 29-year-old archaeologist working on the project. Even she herself had never heard of it, she admits. When the project leaders arrived, they found a village based on agriculture and animal rearing, she said. Tourism was an alien concept, and the village was in a general state of dilapidation. Many of the locals had moved away to towns and cities elsewhere in the country.

With little state infrastructure or services, waste management consisted largely of throwing garbage down the ravines or tossing it in the street. "When we came here last year,

there was 30 years' worth of garbage in the village square," Tare said. The project's first task was to clear up the trash, both inside the village and in the nearby ravine. Now the village square has been cleared, and villagers drive their sheep past stonemasons chipping at rocks, the sound of chisels striking stone echoing through the sultry summer heat as they work on the village's biggest single project: a new guesthouse, scheduled for completion

next spring. The overall project includes restoring old buildings to be used as guesthouses, and helping locals start grass-roots bed-and-breakfast businesses in their homes. Sinatrakaj says locals quickly embraced the project once they saw the potential for tourism. For Dallandyshe Merio, a local woman who left the village two decades ago and moved to the southern port town of Vlora, the project has brought such hope to the village that she is considering moving back.

"I'm happy that the village has come back to life again. Before, everyone was gone," said Merio, who initially converted one of the rooms in her house in the village for paying guests. When she saw how well the system worked with her first guest, a German, she renovated a second room and now runs a small bed-and-breakfast. "People are coming back and rebuilding," she said. Crucially, part of the project includes turning the dirt track leading to the village from the nearest town of Tepelene into a road, to ease access.

But the danger of opening up too fast to too much tourism is a real one, and something Tare and Sinatrakaj are well aware of. The aim, they say, is not to turn Nivica into a place where tour buses disgorge thousands of tourists, something that would shatter the tranquility of the area and endanger the local way of life. "As we know, tourism has a lot of good benefits but also negative effects, such as destroying local culture and destroying (the) environment. And that's a very good point to take into consideration," Tare said.

"And as we go slow, we're trying to convert the traditional hospitality to a more welcoming feeling and place for visitors to come, without disturbing the local culture. It is a challenging aspect, of course, and time will tell if we are right or not."—AP
