Kuwait looking into importing Iraqi natural gas

KUWAIT: Kuwait is looking into ways to import Iraqi natural gas and is negotiating a deal on the final price, said Kuwaiti Minister of Oil and Minister of Electricity and Water Essam Al-Marzouq yesterday. Speaking to the press on the sidelines of the 99th meeting of the ministerial council of the Organization of Arab Petroleum Exporting Countries (OAPEC), Marzouq revealed that importing gas from Iraq will be carried out through a new network of pipelines that will replace an old system.

KUWAIT: At Sabah Hospital, it is no longer business as usual. The wards appear to be empty with few patients around. At the male ward, Kuwait Times spoke to one of the patients (or rather the only patient) in a room that usually accommodates at least eight, as he packed his things to leave the hospital. "I can't afford to pay KD 10 per day - it's not worth it. I would rather go to a private hospital," said Afzal, a Pakistani expat. At the Al-Razi Hospital too, the halls were quiet and mostly empty.

Hospital staff may be glad over the reduced number of patients, but the expat medical staff is not happy with the increase in fees, which they too must pay. From Sabah Hospital to Adan Hospital, the mood appears to be the same. "Why should I pay KD 10 just for a mere consultation?" asked a male nurse who spoke on the condition of anonymity. "I have been working here at Adan Hospital for nine years. I have never seen anything more demoralizing than this," he added, referring to the hike in medical fees.

The new medical fees stipulate that all expatriates including doctors, nurses, pharmacists, medical lab technicians, etc, pay KD 10 (instead of KD 2) at hospitals and an extra KD 10 for each day an expat stays in the hospital,

Cabinet almost ready; Assembly session fails over govt no-show

KUWAIT: Prime Minister HH Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah has almost completed the formation of his new government, and the Cabinet is expected to be officially announced and sworn-in by HH the Amir today. The new Cabinet, according to well-informed sources, includes many new faces, with the main highlight being the inclusion of Sheikh Nasser Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, the eldest son of the Amir, in his first

Sheikh Nasser, 69, who has been minister of the Amiri Diwan since early 2006 - a post not in the Cabinet - will become the first deputy premier and defense minister, the most senior post in the Cabinet after the prime minister. Most of the members of the previous Cabinet have either been left out or reshuffled to new posts. The sources explained Sheikh Jaber agreed to include Jenan Bushehri - a former member of the Municipal Council - in the Cabinet as minister of

housing, replacing Yasser Abul. Sheikh Jaber also thought it would be best to exclude former nominee and Municipal Council member Ali Al-Moussa after he settled on appointing another former Municipal Council member Hossam Al-Roumi as minister of public works.

The sources added that some Rasheedi tribe members asked the PM to appoint one of their qualified members as minister, and the PM considered appointing MP Ali Al-Deqbasi, but on second thoughts decided to retain Mohammed Al-Jabri in office. He finally agreed to appoint Bakheet Al-Rasheedi as oil minister.

New protests flare over US Jerusalem declaration

JERUSALEM: New protests flared in the Middle East and elsewhere yesterday over US President Donald Trump's declaration of Jerusalem as Israel's capital, a move that has drawn global condemnation and sparked days of unrest in the Palestinian territories. Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, who has repeatedly warned of the consequences of Trump's move, also lashed out by calling Israel a "terrorist state" that "kills children". Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, speaking at a press conference with French President Emmanuel Macron in Paris, hit back, calling Erdogan a leader who "bombs Kurdish villagers" and "helps terrorists".

Trump's announcement on Wednesday has been followed by days of protests and clashes in the Palestinian territories. Four Palestinians were killed either in clashes or by Israeli air strikes in retaliation for rockets fired from the Gaza Strip. Yesterday, a Palestinian stabbed an Israeli security guard at Jerusalem's central bus station, leaving him in a serious condition. The Palestinian was arrested.

Tens of thousands have also protested in Muslim and Arab countries, including Jordan, Turkey, Pakistan and Malaysia. Further protests were held in countries including Lebanon, İndonesia, Egypt and Morocco as well as the Palestinian territories yesterday. Lebanese



security forces fired tear gas and water cannons at several hundred demonstrators near the American embassy. Tens of thousands rallied in Morocco's capital Rabat, many waving Palestinian flags.

In Jakarta, some 5,000 Indonesians protested in solidarity with the Palestinians, gathering outside the US embassy in the world's most-populous Muslim country. Students and professors in Cairo demonstrated at the prestigious Al-Azhar University, a university spokesman said, with pictures on social media showing several hundred protesters.

Germany praises Kuwait's diplomacy for hosting GCC summit

KUWAIT: Germany praised Kuwait's diplomacy for hosting the recently GCC summit, as it also strongly supports Kuwait mediation efforts in the region. "Just the fact that a meeting on this level would take place, it will allow a united voice back again. It's another success for Kuwaiti mediation here in the region, so we strongly support such mediation," German Ambassador to Kuwait, Karlfried Bergner said in an interview.

"First I would like to congratulate His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah and the Kuwaiti diplomacy for hosting the GCC summit. There were many people involved in making this summit happen. We think just the fact that a meeting on this level will take place is already big progress in the Gulf affairs, this is another success for the Kuwaiti mediation, it will allow the Gulf to find its united voice back again, so we strongly support this mediation," Bergner underlined.

When asked about Germany's role in the region and in the Gulf crisis, Bergner said, "as you know, Germany is following up developments in the region very closely, our foreign minister was twice here in the region last April, and at the start of last July, and he is thoroughly following this issue, and he has strong interests in it. But as you know, like Kuwait, we have a caretaking government, Germany went through an election last September, but the minister remains active and he follows developments very closely, and he appreciates all of His Highness the Amir efforts in this mediation."

"On one hand it was a serious situation, it affected not only the countries involved, but also for example Germany, and other countries, because it basically was hurting business and political interests because it's a unified Gulf Cooperation Council. On the other hand, we know that the GCC have gone through rough patches in the past, so we are confident it will overcome these problems," Bergner noted.

On bilateral relations, the ambassador noted that on a political level both countries are on one page. "We will continue to do so; Germany will have a very prominent role in the conference on Iraq that will take place in February here. We are very much involved in the reconstruction in Iraq, so we are very much involved politically with Kuwait, I also commend the (Kuwaiti) government in continuing its long-term infrastructure projects with

Germany. I think this will be good for the Kuwaiti economy, it will open perspectives and opportunities for German companies." Thirdly, "I still hope we would improve cultural cooperation. We hope that the project for the University of Munich in Kuwait will actually take hold at the beginning of next year."

On the ongoing process of forming a government in Germany, Bergner said, "frankly speaking, the voters now have been split now more than ever. We have now six or seven parties in parliament. We used to have three to four, where it's more difficult to form a government."

However, "it's early now to speculate, we hope to see a coalition government, but this is difficult, I am quite confident now that we will make it through." In response to US President Donald Trump's decision to relocate the embassy to Jerusalem, Bergner said, "we clearly stick to the agreed way. Our embassy will remain in Tel Aviv, I think we have no plans to follow that, and I think it will test the patience of the Palestinian authority very much, if such a move would happen." On Iran and the nuclear deal, the ambassador said, "We don't think that Iran has not complied with the nuclear deal, so we don't see any need to reconsider the nuclear deal, and we are strongly in favor of keeping it up, because it's the best solution." On Yemen, Bergner noted that the situation there is tense and unstable, but stressed importance on the humanitarian aspect there, due to famine in many areas. — KUNA

Top European lawmaker says Kuwait qualified for Schengen exemption

BRUSSELS: The President of the Belgian Senate Christine Defraigne has reiterated her strong support that Kuwaiti citizens be exempted from the Schengen visa for the EU. She expressed her position during a luncheon that she hosted in honor of Kuwait's ambassador to Belgium, Luxembourg, NATO and EU, Jassem Al-Budaiwi, at the Belgian Senate yesterday.

Budaiwi said that Defrainge said Kuwait is a strong candidate and qualified for exemption from Schengen visa and that she will raise this matter with relevant authorities. Over the luncheon, the Belgian Senate President expressed appreciation for being cordially received by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah during her visit to Kuwait last November.

She lauded the Amir as a "wise and mod-

erate leader," noting that His Highness is exerting all efforts to calm down the situation in the region. Defrainge also expressed thanks to Kuwaiti National Assembly Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanem for the fruitful discussions aimed at strengthening bilateral ties. During her visit, she also met His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, as well as First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah and former Prime Minister His Highness Sheikh Nasser Al-Mohammad Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, as she discussed with them a number of important subjects of mutual interest.

She underlined Belgium's interests in strengthening bilateral ties with Kuwait and in boosting economic, trade and political cooperation. Meanwhile, Ambassador Budaiwi informed Defraigne that a number of high-ranking visits from Kuwait to Belgium are in the pipeline for early next year. Among others, Kuwaiti deputy foreign minister Khaled Al-Jarallah is expected to visit Brussels early 2018.

Ambassador Budaiwi underlined that both Belgium and Kuwait see eye-to-eye on most regional and international issues and support all efforts to establish peace and security in the world. "Both Belgium and Kuwait are very keen to move the ties to higher levels," he added. — KUNA

US Jerusalem decision detrimental to peace: Arab FMs



How can we rationalize the insanity of deciding to alienate an entire people by giving their capital to the occupiers? How can we permit a country to be invaded? When Kuwait was invaded, the whole world stood with us. Where is the world today? Sure, we hear many governments warning about the repercussions of such a decision, even vetoing it for now. But what is the end result? According to Zvi Bar-el, an Israeli Middle East Affairs analyst, nothing will change. He states that "[t]he irony is that despite the anger with Trump, the Arab states and most Muslim states will continue to see the United States as a vital ally to preserve their interests, while the Israeli Palestinian conflict will remain a subject for dinner party talks and go on feeding the usual narratives." So, basically, the people will remain stuck while allies resume affairs due to mutual

But, how long will this nightmare last? Will it continue to be the side of money that has to be victorious? Will the safety of a country be ensured only by how much money is being pumped to those who not so secretly rule our planet? Can we actually stop the system in place, or are we forced to watch this unfold before our eyes, helplessly, powerlessly as ever?

If this decision goes into effect, what are we supposed to do? How much longer can we watch this circus? We must come together and defend Palestinians and their right to a home; and we do not need a war to save Palestine. We need Gandhis, Luther Kings, Mandelas in power. Only the arms industry thrives by creating war. The arms industry profits when we want to eliminate each other, when we focus on our differences, our heritage, our ideologies.

We can no longer afford to make it easy for them by attaching ourselves to a matrix that is way past its expiry date. More than ever, we all need to make our voices heard, loud and clear, that we will not support this, that we are standing united against tyranny.

This is not about a protest, or a revolution. This is about finding ways to refute this decision. We are so fed up of turning on the news and constantly being bombarded with fear. The solution is so easy. The only way to peace is through peace. If world leaders cannot find a solution to the problems they create in order to fatten their wallets, perhaps we can.

The whole world is watching people in power provoking our brothers and sisters, who they have already slaughtered, whose homes they have bulldozed, whose children they have imprisoned, whose country they have raped all under the pretext of some divine plan. It sounds more like the prodding of the devil.

All land is holy, but we humans make it unholy by monopolizing source. We are not as special as we think. Nothing special about our birthplace, skin color, bloodline or appearance. What makes us special is our ability to share, to love, to expand our consciousness.

This is not an Arab or Muslim cause. This is certainly not an anti-Jew cause either. If it becomes one, then we are only dividing ourselves further. Most people, including Jews, support Palestine though the media disguises this fact. This is a cause for humanity. Our humanity. And this is a test that will show how united we are in standing with the dispossessed, how the power should return to where it belongs: with the people. Because people no longer glorify war as we did in days of yore. And the victims of war are never the ones who instigate it. It is always the people, or the dictators put in place by those who instigate war, that perish. We are not pawns. We are souls. And we have a right to live without constantly being at war or on the brink of it. Enough! Surely, we have all had enough of

Constitutional courts guarantee authority, says Justice Minister

KUWAIT: Higher courts back up the constitution and protect the people while keeping authority intact, Kuwait's Minister of Justice and Minister of State for National Assembly Affairs Falah Al-Azb said yesterday. Addressing a Kuwait Lawyers Association-hosted conference over the role of constitutional courts, Azb spoke of his country's eagerness to ameliorate the constitutional system. He pointed out that Kuwait should learn a thing or two from nations with ultra-developed constitutional systems.

Meanwhile, Haila Al-Mukaimi, the head of the conference's organizing committee, said that Kuwait's constitutional system is thriving by virtue of recent legislative amendments, where individual rights take precedence over constitutional law. She added that the conference brings together a bevy of experts to discuss a number of studies over constitutional courts in the Arab region. — KUNA

CAIRO: Kuwaiti First Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah deplored the US decision to recognize Jerusalem as capital of Israel and move its embassy to the holy city. In his address to the emergency meeting of the Arab League Ministerial Council on Saturday, Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled, who led the Kuwaiti delegation to the meeting, called on the United States to back down on the recent "regrettable and unhelpful step," and restore its role as impartial mediator and sponsor in the Middle East peace process. A year back, the Middle East was remarkably upbeat with the adoption of the UN Security Council Resolution 2334 on December 23, 2016, and an international consensus on prioritization of the peace process, he recalled.

In early 2017, the ministerial Middle East Peace Conference, hosted by Paris, reaffirmed support for a just, lasting and comprehensive resolution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. "Optimism grew further last May when the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia hosted the GCC-US Summit with both sides agreeing to work together for advancing the peace process," Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled noted.

"However, this process degenerated remarkably due to the recent deplorable unilateral move by the US which contravenes all UN resolutions relating to the legal, political and historical status quo of Jerusalem," he said, citing the UNSC resolutions 242, 267, 465, 476, 478 and 2334.

"The discussions at the last night session of the UNSC signal profound concern of the international community over the unhelpful move of the US," he pointed out. "While calling on the US to back down on its decision and resume its role as impartial mediator and sponsor of the peace process, we call on the Arab states to adopt a single stance against the US move.

We call for activation of the resolution of the 28th Arab summit, hosted by Jordan in last March, on the protection of the legal, political and historical status quo in Jerusalem," he stressed. Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled reaffirmed Kuwait's support to "the brothers in Palestine," and commitment to all resolutions and measures to be adopted by today's extraordinary ministerial meeting. He thanked Palestine and the Kingdom of Jordan for calling this meeting and the foreign ministers of the Arab League member countries for their prompt response.

Complication

Arab foreign ministers agreed that the US recognition of Jerusalem as capital of Israel could only complicate the Middle East peace process and undermine the final status talks between Palestine and Israel. The US move is detrimental to the peace efforts and constitutes provocation to



Muslims worldwide, Saudi Foreign Minister Adel Al-Jubair said in his address to the emergency meeting. The Arab peace initiative charted a roadmap for resolving the Arab-Israeli conflict with the relevant UN resolutions being points of reference. These resolutions affirm that east Jerusalem is an integral part of the occupied Palestinian territories and nullify all measures adopted by Israel to change status quo in the holy city, he reminded.

The Saudi minister added that Jerusalem is one of the main issues on the agenda of the final status talks between the Palestinians and the Israelis, noting that any unilateral move could only complicate the negotiating process. Meanwhile, Egyptian Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry said his country is firmly opposed to the US move that runs counter to the international legitimacy. "The US decision and any impacts resulting from it are totally groundless and thereby unacceptable," he stressed. Shoukry regretted the deplorable shift in the US policy towards the holy city which risks turning the already tense situation in Palestine into flashpoint for the entire Middle East.

Appropriate measures

In the meantime, Lebanese Foreign Minister Gebran Bassil called on the Arab countries to adopt whatever

measures they deem appropriate against the US decision. He revealed that he will table an urgent complaint to the UN Security Council and ask the Lebanese cabinet to adopt measures against the US decision. Bassil stressed the Arab identity of the holy city, noting that the Arabs can never relinquish their claim to the city in the face of any occupying power. Tunisian Foreign Minister Khemaies Jhinaoui said the US move is a flagrant violation of the UN resolutions and risks undermine the Middle East peace process. "The move paves the way for Israel to persist in its aggressive policy against the Palestinian people and the Islamic sanctities in the holy city, thus pushing the region into more tensions. "It gives the green light for Israel to continue judaizing the holy city, change its demographical structure and speed up the settlement activities in the occupied territories," he warned.

On a similar note, Algerian Foreign Minister Abdelkader Messahel said the US decision constitutes "an unprecedented transgression on the international legitimacy and the Islamic and Christian sanctities in the holy city."

"The US administration failed to calculate properly the impacts of its decision on peace and security in the region and beyond. The serious decision showed a blatant bias by the US in favor of Israel." he added. — KUNA

No plans to reverse health fee hikes: Minister

KUWAIT: Health Minister Dr Jamal Al-Harbi strongly denied social media reports claiming that his decision to increase health service fees for expatriates was going to be reversed, noting that the decision has saved the state around 40 percent of medical expenses, solved the problem of overcrowding in public hospitals, and accelerated medicine and hospital beds' provision. Meanwhile, Harbi said that he has authorized hospital managers and heads of medical centers to exempt urgent expat cases from the fees, namely patients with heart diseases and those whose condition requires intensive care.

Supply good


The Finance Ministry yesterday sent a letter to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry inquiring about the latter's request to facilitate the payment of KD 9.5 million to Kuwait Supplies Company. In its response, the commerce ministry explained that the money is owed to the company for its services in selling supply goods to citizens. Also, according to ministerial decision number 378/2015, the company is entitled to seven percent of the cost of the supply goods it sells, in addition to five percent of the cost of supplying construction materials. Kuwait Supplies Company is wholly owned by the government and was established to provide supply goods to citizens flexibly and to avoid bureaucracy.

Recruitment suspended

The Ministry of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs suspended recruitment in various sectors and departments until the end of this week, saying that the decision gives ministry officials time to organize and attempt to create openings for new recruits. The ministry has not yet solved the problem of appointing over 1,500 new female employees nominated by the Civil Service Commission (CSC) two months earlier. A suggestion made to appoint the new female employees in women praying places was rejected, and thus, the ministry had to suspend recruitment until mid-December pending setting a new recruitment system. The decision has created a state of anger and dissatisfaction among the new employees and their families.

Expats replaced

Meanwhile, Head of the Fatwa and Legislation Department Chancellor Salah Al-Mas'ad announced that expatriate employees have been replaced with citizens in the entire department and asked the CSC to nominate citizens to be appointed in three different majors. Mas'ad explained that the department needs at least ten new employees with degrees in calculus, 50 employees with degrees in law in addition to a number of secretarial staff members. In other news, the commerce ministry plans to refer employees who had been in service for 30 years to retirement by the end of December 2017, said informed sources, noting that the lists of those employees are currently being submitted to the minister for approval. The ministry has issued a directive in this regard and has given concerned employees the option of resigning instead of being referred to retirement in order to get more benefits.



Abundance of new cities

Among some 30 new cities launched in Egypt since the 1960s, with white and grey walls and brick roofs, inspired by suburbs in the United States and the Gulf, a city called New Cairo stands between Cairo and the new capital's location. It was supposed to house four million people, but only 1.5 million Cairenes live in the district, which also houses banks and businesses. "We can compare the new capital to New Cairo," said Ahmed Zaazaa, an urban architect and planner at 10 Tooba, where a group of researchers promote an alternative urban policy.— AFP

Rouhani meeting wraps **British FM's** 'worthwhile' visit

TEHRAN: Britain's foreign minister Boris Johnson met with Iranian President Hassan Rouhani yesterday, wrapping up a visit in which he pushed for the release of imprisoned dual nationals. A key focus of Johnson's visit had been the case of British-Iranian Nazanin Zaghari-Ratcliffe, who is serving five years for taking part in mass protests in 2009, which she denies. She was due in court on Sunday for fresh charges of "spreading propaganda", but her husband announced that the appearance had been cancelled at the

"Nazanin's case was not held today in the wake of the foreign secretary's visit. This is undoubtedly a good sign," Richard Ratcliffe wrote in an email to reporters. He said Johnson met with her family in Iran and raised the issue in every meeting with the Iranians. The foreign secretary took flak from Iranian officials for not doing more to build on the nuclear deal signed with world powers in 2015. "Relations between the two countries have not matched the potential expected in the post-JCPOA (nuclear deal) atmosphere," Rouhani told Johnson, according to a statement from his office.

There was similar criticism from the



who met with Johnson on Saturday and said other European countries had put in "much more effort". "You haven't even solved the banking problems of the Iranian embassy in London," Larijani said, according to the IRNA news agency. The British foreign office said the two sides had discussed "the full range of regional and bilateral issues, including banking matters and our concerns about the consular cases of dual nationals". "It has been a worthwhile visit and we leave with a sense that both sides want to keep up the momentum to resolve the difficult issues," it said in a statement.

The Zaghari-Ratcliffe case has become powerful parliament speaker, Ali Larijani, a top priority for Johnson after he mistak-

enly said last month that she had been training journalists in Iran - a "slip of the tongue" used by the Iranian authorities to help justify the new charges. Iran has been frustrated that the nuclear deal, which lifted sanctions in exchange for curbs to its nuclear program, has not produced the expected windfall in trade deals mainly due to continuing US sanctions.

Banking restrictions have also complicated long-running efforts to return an estimated 450 million pounds (\$600 million) owed by Britain from a military contract cancelled due to the 1979 Islamic revolution. Richard Ratcliffe has claimed his wife is a pawn in Iran's efforts to extract the historic debt. — AFP

Climate victims seek justice, on the street and in the courtroom

PARIS: People around the world beset by the impacts of global warming like droughts, heat waves and storm surges are calling for "climate justice," and many are pleading their cases in court. Globally, there are at least 1,000 active legal cases related to climate change, more than two-thirds of them in the United States, according to a recent tally from the Grantham Research Institute on Climate Change and the Environment, in London. A summit Tuesday in Paris-with more than 50 heads of state attending-on how to finance the transition to a low-carbon economy will be followed the next day by a climate justice forum.

Concept

The climate justice movement highlights the fact that rich nations are overwhelmingly to blame for causing climate change, but that poor ones have been the first to cope with its impacts. The 1992 UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) recognized that inequality, declaring that developed countries bear a larger responsibility for fixing the problem. After a climate justice "summit" in The Hague in 2000, a coalition of global non-governmental organizations (NGOs) -

which play a crucial role in channeling grassroots activism-adopted 27 principles.

These included the right to not suffer climate change impacts, a moratorium on new fossil fuel exploration, access to affordable and sustainable energy, the notion that rich nations and industry owe humanity an "ecological debt". "Climate justice affirms the rights of unborn generations to natural resources, a stable climate and a healthy planet," they declared. These ideas slowly gravitated from the fringes toward the centre of formal UN negotiations-and finally into the preamble of the 2015 Paris Agreement, the 196-nation treaty that enjoins the world to cap global warming at "well under" two degrees Celsius (3.6 degrees Fahrenheit).

Cases In parallel to the diplomatic arena, citizens and civic groups also tested the concept's power within a legal framework. Some plaintiffs have targeted governments, while others have taken on individual companies. A few have made headlines: In 2015, a landmark court ruling in the Netherlands ordered the government to slash greenhouse gases a quarter by 2020. The case was brought by 900 Dutch citizens. The government is appealing. Last month, a German court agreed to hear a Peruvian farmer's case against energy giant RWE over climate change damage in the Andes, a decision hailed by campaigners as a 'historic breakthrough". Farmer Saul Luciano Lliuva says that RWE-one of the world's top emitters of climate-altering carbon dioxidemust share in the cost of protecting his hometown Huaraz from a glacier lake overflowing from melted snow and ice. — AFP

Alabama's choice: Democrat or accused sexual predator

Republican, Democratic opponent face off

BIRMINGHAM: When Alabama voters cast ballots to select a US Senator they will face a choice that echoes the country's partisan political divide: elect a Democrat or pick a man accused of preying on teenaged girls. The Republican candidate-backed by President Donald Trump-is Roy Moore, a former state judge known for his battles to publicly display the Ten Commandments. He has more recently made headlines over accusations that he pursued girls as young as 14 when he was in his 30s.

Voters tomorrow can choose Moore or his Democratic opponent Doug Jones, a former federal prosecutor. Or they

could shun both by writing the name of another candidate not listed on the ballota move that could split the Republican vote and help Jones. Alabama has not elected a Democrat to the US Senate since 1992, and a Jones win would reduce the already-slim Republican majority in the upper house of Congress from 52 to 51 seats out of 100.

In Alabama, a southern state where Trump won

62 percent of the vote, voting for a Democrat is unthinkable for many Republicans, even if they believe the allegations against Moore, which he has rejected as "fake news" orchestrated by his enemies. For Ann Wright, a 69year-old retiree living in a suburb of Birmingham, the answer is Moore. "I'm sorry, but just to keep the Democrats out," she said is her reasoning. People "probably think Alabama is terrible, and they go around saying, 'Oh, you voted for a pedophile.' Well, it really hasn't been proven yet," she added.

'Get it over with' Multiple women have come forward to accuse Moore of pursuing them when they were teenagers, including one who said he groped her when she was 14 and another who said he assaulted her at age 16."During that period of time, there were teenage girls that were dating older men," said Wright, noting that: "I had people in my high school that dated guys in their twenties." Other Republicans have expressed similar sentiments, and while Moore plunged in the polls after the initial revelations, he has come back slightly ahead.

For those voters who believe the accusations against Moore, there is a third option aside from him or Jones: write in another candidate. That's what 70-year-old retired teacher Laura Strubel, who opposes Jones' stance in favor of a woman's right to have an abortion, plans to do. The election and the surrounding controversy is "crazy" and she is "ready to get it

over with," Strubel said. Gadsden, the mall where Moore reportedly pursued teenaged girls, is still there, crowded ahead of the Christmas holiday. It's not hard to find people who know Moore, such as Linda Fain, a librarian who said she went out several times with him and his wife.

'Disaster' for Alabama

"He's a good man," she said, while "the ladies that have come forward are not so truthful." But some young people are not as indulgent. At a hair salon, Emma Howell, the 21-

News in brief

Czech leader blasts EU

PRAGUE: Czech President Milos Zeman has accused EU states of being "cowards" in their response to his US counterpart Donald Trump recognizing Jerusalem as Israel's capital. "The European Union, cowards, are doing all they can so a pro-Palestinian terrorist movement can have supremacy over a pro-Israeli movement," said Zeman, presenting himself as a defender of Israel. The 73year-old Zeman, targeting a second term from January and who had Friday said he was happy at Trump's controversial move, made the comment before delegates attending the congress of the far right Freedom and Direct Democracy party, which opposes immigration and the EU. Trump recognized Jerusalem as Israel's capital on Wednesday in a move that outraged Palestinian leaders, but which was hailed as historic by Israel. Zeman said he had himself spoken in favor of Prague moving the Czech embassy to Jerusalem from Tel Aviv on a visit four years ago-a proposal which met with a reserved political response in his homeland.

Indian trooper kills comrades

NEW DELHI: A paramilitary soldier has killed four of his comrades and injured another inside a camp in central India, an official said yesterday. The trooper turned his gun on his fellow soldiers at around 5:00 pm local time Saturday in Bijapur district of Chhattisgarh state. The constable from India's paramilitary Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) opened fire following a reported altercation. "He fired on four of his CRPF colleagues, who died on the spot. Another one, an ASI (assistant sub-inspector), was injured in the incident," a Bijapur administrative official said, speaking on condition of anonymity. A senior state police officer, Sundar Raj P, told local media late Saturday that "what happened, why he did it, under what circumstances-these are matters that are being investigated". He said the officer, 35-year-old Sanath Kumar, was arrested and was being interrogated. Chhattisgarh's chief minister took to Twitter to condemn the killing of the CRPF soldiers, who are deployed for counter-insurgency operations.

Venezuela holds polls

CARACAS: Venezuelans headed to the polls yesterday for mayoral elections in which an opposition boycott and voter enthusiasm undercut by economic crisis give President Nicolas Maduro's party a clear path to victory. There are some 14,000 polling stations country-wide, according to the National Election Council (CNE), which began to open early yesterday. The main opposition parties are staying away because they say the vote lacks any guarantees of fairness or transparency as voters pick 335 mayors across the country. The lack of a serious challenge to Maduro aligned candidates has led to skepticism in the main cities of Caracas, Maracaibo and San Cristobal. "I'm not going to vote because I don't believe in the transparency of the CNE," said Nerver Huerta, a 38-year-old graphic designer in Caracas. Maduro's ruling socialist party will be aided by the refusal of the three main parties in the opposition coalition Democratic Union Roundtable (MUD) to participate, although smaller parties have decided to contest the election.

Japan priestess stabbed

TOKYO: A Shinto priestess was killed on the grounds of a famous Tokyo shrine by a man wielding a traditional Japanese sword who then killed another woman before committing suicide, police said, in what local media described as an apparent family feud. Nagako Tomioka, 58, chief priestess of Tomioka Hachimangu shrine in Tokyo, was attacked by Shigenaga Tomioka, 56, as she got out of a car on Thursday evening. Media reports said he was her younger brother. Also, a woman aged in her 30s who was with Shigenaga Tomioka attacked and stabbed the driver of the car with a Japanese sword, police said. The injuries to his shoulder and chest were not life-threatening. After slashing the priestess, Shigenaga Tomioka then stabbed the younger woman to death with a sword, before killing himself, police said.

Squaring circles: EÜ, UK plot next Brexit chapter

BRUSSELS: The European Commission and the British government let out an audible sigh of relief on reaching Friday's historic Brexit divorce terms deal. Yet numerous questions remain on the future trade relationship between the EU 27 and the bloc's departing member as the discussions now move on to a new phase at a December 14-15 Brussels summit. The EU's chief Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier warned "there is still work to be done" to "consolidate" the progress made to date. The preamble to the 15page divorce deal published after British Prime Minister Theresa May's morning dash for talks with European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker illustrates the still precarious nature of the deal. "Under the caveat that nothing is agreed until everything is agreed, the joint commitments set out below in this joint report shall be reflected in the Withdrawal Agreement in full detail," says the introduction to the text. The conclusion notes that the deal is conditional on "an overall agreement under Article 50 on the UK's withdrawal, taking into account the framework for the future relationship, including an agreement as early as possible in 2018 on transitional arrangements".

Unanswered questions

Even Friday's deal itself leaves elements open to question surrounding the thorny issue of the Irish border post-Brexit, along with the size of Britain's divorce bill and the protection of expats' rights. The deal is clear on guaranteeing the post-Brexit rights of Britons already living in the bloc and of their EU counterparts based in Britain with family members able to claim residence. But there is no mention, for example, of future spouses. "We demand before we can give green light to the withdrawal agreement, that... the future free movement and residence of UK citizens will also be guaranteed and this in all 27 Member States," said Guy Verhofstadt, leader of the liberals group in the European Parliament. It is not yet clear if British



expats will be able to retain their full current rights when they move to another EU country. Regarding citizens rights, the divorce bill text indicates Britain will bring forward a bill to incorporate them into UK law. On adoption, the bill's provisions in relation to citizens' rights "will prevail over inconsistent or incompatible legislation, unless Parliament expressly repeals this Act in future". But it is not clear what will happen if Westminster actually one day repeals the bill. "Any change by UK parliament to citizens" rights will be very visible and can only happen via express repeal of treaty," was how Stefaan de Rynck, a member of the EU negotiating team, commented on Twitter.

How much will it cost?

There are also elements of ambiguity as to the exact size of the divorce bill, despite the methodology having been agreed to determine how deep Britain must delve into its pockets. "We cannot calculate exactly the sums in question-all these figures will fluctuate," says Barnier, although unofficial EU estimations are in the order of 60 billion euros (\$70 billion). Britain puts the sum at between 40 and 45 billion euros, though that does not include items such as an EU-guaranteed loan for Ukraine, which could generate costs for all current EU members-Britain included.

Then there is the issue of the border between Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland, which almost scuppered the deal over concerns in the North that Britain was headed for a deal entailing a 'hard' border separating the former from the rest of the United Kingdom. In the agreement, the United Kingdom says it "remains committed to protecting North-South cooperation and to its guarantee of avoiding a hard border" between the two.—AFP

KABUL: French and Algerian fighters, some arriving from Syria, have joined the ranks of the Islamic State group in northern Afghanistan where the militants have established new bases, multiple international and Afghan sources have said. It is the first time that the presence of French IS fighters has been recorded in Afghanistan, and comes as analysts suggested foreigners may be heading for the war-torn country after being driven from Syria and Iraq.

It is also a troubling sign as France, which has faced the worst of the IS-inspired violence in Europe since 2015, debates how to handle hundreds of its citizens who went to fight for the group in the Middle East. "A number" of Algerian and French nationals entered the largely IS-controlled district of Darzab in northern Jowzjan province in November, said district governor Baaz Mohammad Dawar. At least two women were among the arrivals, who were travelling with a translator from Tajikistan as well as Chechens and Uzbeks, Dawar added. European and Afghan security sources in Kabul confirmed Dawar's claim that French citizens were among the fighters-though, one cautioned, 'we do not know how many there are".

'The Engineers'

Three of the Algerians seen in Darzab are

believed to have been in Syria and Iraq, Dawar said, suggesting they may link Islamic State-Khorasan Province (IS-K), the group's franchise in Afghanistan and Pakistan, with the main group in the Middle East. When it first emerged in 2015, IS-K overran large parts of eastern Nangarhar and Kunar provinces, though initially its part in the Afghan conflict

was overshadowed by the Taleban. The jihadists have since spread north, including in Jowzjan on the border with Uzbekistan, and carried out multiple devastating attacks in the capital Kabul. Mohammad Raza Ghafoori, the Jowzjan provincial governor's spokesman, said French-speaking Caucasian men and women had been seen training IS fighters in Darzab. He cited reports saying that around 50 children, some as young as 10, have also been

recruited by the fighters. Darzab residents said that roughly 200 foreigners had set up camp just a few hundred meters from the village of Bibi Mariam. One local man who gave his name as Hajji said the fighters were of several nationalities, including French, and were tall, aged in their late 20s, and dressed in military clothing. "They ride their (motor) bikes, go to the border and come back, but they talk to nobody," he said. Hashar, a former district village chief, said some were training others to use suicide bombs and lav mines. "They are... bringing misery to normal people," he said, as other villagers said many residents had fled the area.

Locals along with district governor Dawar warned the fighters were also exploiting natural resources, such as precious stones and metals. One of the security sources said that two of the French had been nicknamed "The Engineers" and appeared to be organizing

some sort of extraction, "but we do not know what they are looking for". Several European services believe the fighters are arriving through Tajikistan, the source said, adding that at least one Frenchman arrested there in July said he had wanted to join IS in Afghanistan.

Land of jihad

Afghanistan has long attracted foreign fighters, from the mujahedeen during the 1980s war against Soviet invaders to Al-Qaeda's later use of the country as a haven. The Pentagon has said IS numbers fewer than 1,000 in Afghanistan. But the growing presence of foreign fighters among them indicates that IS "seeks to create an external operations node for new waves of global attacks," warned analysts at the Washington-based Institute for the Study of War recently. Aymenn Jawad Al-Tamimi, an expert on jihadist groups, said he did not think the presence of foreign fighters in Afghanistan meant that IS was necessarily "shifting its base".

The group's "natural home is Iraq and Syria, but I presume many of the foreigners in particular are taking the opportunity either to escape entirely or moving to other battlefields for IS where they might prove more useful," he said. —AFP

Yazidis caught in 'political football' between Baghdad and Iraqi Kurds

Yazidi heartland seized from Kurds by Baghdad loyalists

SINJAR: Since Iraqi forces pushed the Kurds out of the Yazidis' mountainous heartland of Sinjar in northern Iraq in October, residents are wondering what could happen to them next. Food and money are in short supply since aid organizations stopped delivery after Iraq's advance. Buildings collapsed in the fighting and of those still standing, many are marked with bullets and littered with IEDs. Water and electricity barely work.

The Yazidis, whose beliefs combine elements of several ancient Middle Eastern religions, have long been viewed with suspicion and repeatedly persecuted by other groups in Iraq. In 2014, more than 3,000 were killed by Islamic State militants in a campaign described by the United Nations as genocidal. Now the land they have lived on for centuries is caught up in a tug of war between Baghdad and Iraq's Kurds, who had controlled it since the fall of Saddam Hussein in 2003.

"We're trapped in this game of political football, between Iraq and the Kurds," said a Yazidi resident of Sinjar, Kamal Ali. "But neither of them cares about our future." The militias have hoisted Iraq's tricolor flag over government buildings and any remaining Kurdish flags have been scrawled over with the words "Iraq" and "Allahu Akbar", the blazing sun at its centre scribbled over in black marker. Sinjar is politically important because it's in the disputed territories, ethnically mixed areas across northern Iraq, long the subject of a constitutional dispute between Baghdad and the Kurds, who both claim them.

Sinjar fell under the Kurds' control, despite lying outside Iraqi Kurdistan's recognized borders. Baghdad did little to challenge the arrangement until its October offensive, launched to punish the Kurds for their Sept 25 independence referendum. Iraqi forces have seized the disputed areas the Kurds had expanded into including Sinjar. The referendum reignited long-simmering tensions over geographic dominance in the oil-rich north, between Baghdad and the Kurdish Regional Government (KRG), who fought side by side to defeat Islamic State.

The Yazidis are divided about what should happen now.

Some are glad the Kurds have gone and see an opportunity for increased autonomy now that they are under federal control following the offensive by Iraq's security forces last October. Kurdish forces handed over Sinjar without a fight to the Lalesh Brigades, a Yazidi militia backed by Baghdad's Shiite paramilitary forces (PMF).

Most Yazidis speak a Kurdish dialect, but many don't see themselves as ethnically Kurdish. "We're happy the Kurds have left," said Abu Sardar, a 47-year-old Yazidi man. "We're Yazidis we're not Kurds, we do not want to be part of Kurdistan." Like others, Abu Sardar complained that the Kurds forced him to vote in the Kurdish referendum, accusations the KRG denies. He returned two months ago to the ruins of his home in the Sinuni district of Sinjar and expressed bitter disappointment that little had changed since he left in 2014: hospitals and schools remain shuttered while the city is still mostly rubble. He hopes that Baghdad and its militias will rebuild Sinjar.

Others lament the Kurds' departure. The KRG and allied Yazidi groups hold former Iraqi Prime Minister Nuri Al-Maliki responsible for the campaign by Islamic State. They say his troops' desertion of Mosul allowed militants to capture billions of dollars in weapons later used to attack the minority. Yazidi commander Qassem Shesho says Iraq's government is too sectarian and dislikes the Yazidis as much as Islamic State. Like many others, he blames the Kurds for the attack by Islamic State. "But they're all we've got," he said. Shesho is allied to Iraqi Kurdistan's ruling Kurdistan Democratic Party, even though the Kurds cut his fighters' salaries after the Lalesh Brigades took over Sinjar.

'City of ghosts'

Some days, residents say, there are only bones in Sinjar. Nearly 50 mass graves have been uncovered outside the town since 2014. "Sinjar is a city of ghosts," said the Lalesh Brigades' leader Ali Serhan Eissa, also known as Khal Ali. Tens of thousands of Yazidis fled the militant onslaught and headed for Mount Sinjar. Of those who didn't reach the mountain, about 3,100 were killed - with more than half shot, beheaded, burned alive and disposed of in mass graves.

Others were sold into sexual slavery or forced to fight, according to a report by the Public Library of Science journal PLoS Medicine. Some are still on the mountain, about to spend a third freezing winter in tents. Before the attack, Sinjar was home to about 400,000 people mainly Yazidis and Arab Sunnis. Only 15 percent of Yazidis have returned home, according to humanitarian estimates. Most Yazidis remain in IDP camps in the Kurdistan region, along with most of the area's displace Sunnis. Aid workers worry the camps will be closed if tensions between Baghdad and the Kurds flare up. The presence of fighters from Turkey's

separatist Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) further complicates the picture. Many Yazidis credit them with opening up a land route to allow those stranded on Mount Sinjar to escape the militants in 2014. The PKK entrenched itself in the community, even creating a local unit, the Sinjar Resistance Units (YBS) which controls multiple checkpoints around Sinjar. Turkey and neighboring Iran are closely watching the power shift in Sinjar. Tehran wants to secure this north-western region of Iraq as it sits on the border with Syria, while Turkey wants the region free of the outlawed PKK.—Reuters

Hashed Al-Shaabi: A controversial force on Iraq frontlines

BAGHDAD: A vital force that helped defeat the Islamic State group, or a dangerous tool of Iran? Fighters from Iraq's Hashed Al-Shaabi have been a controversial irregular element battling on the country's front lines. The organization formed in 2014 after the country's most revered Shiite cleric, Grand Ayatollah Ali Al-Sistani, urged citizens to take up arms against IS jihadists who had swept aside government forces and seized much of northern Iraq.

Bringing together a dizzying array of paramilitary groups under the command of Iraq's prime minister, the Hashed played a key role in battles against IS. But the Shiite-dominated alliance remains deeply divisive and has been accused of a string of abuses. Following Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi's declaration of victory on Saturday in the country's three-year war against IS, how his government deals with the Hashed fighters is a major issue.

Martyrs or puppets?Known in English as the Popular Mobilisation Units, the various forces within the Hashed can field between 60,000 and 140,000 fighters. Iraq's parliament classes it as a state force operating within the country's constitution. While it includes some Christian and Sunni Muslim forces, the umbrella group is dominated by powerful Shiite militias such as Kataeb Hezbollah, Asaib Ahl Al-Haq and the Badr organization.



"To many, these martyrs have given up their lives in defense of their country," the Carnegie Middle East Center said in an April report. But "to many critics, the (Hashed) symbolizes Iranian and Shiite efforts to exercise supremacy over Iraq." It said that while the group is riven with internal rivalries, leaders have regularly

met with Qassem Suleimani, the powerful commander of Iran's elite Revolutionary Guards' foreign operations division. That connection was made public in July, when the Hashed's number two Abu Mahdi Al-Mohandis appeared on Iranian TV speaking Farsi and pledging allegiance to Suleimani.— AFP

Chinese billionaire **Guo wants regime** change in Beijing

NEW YORK: From a luxury Manhattan apartment, Chinese billionaire Guo Wengui is plotting a "change of the regime" in Beijing and developing a new media platform with the aim of introducing democracy in the world's most populous country. The fugitive real estate mogul settled in April in New York, on the 18th floor of a hotel facing Central Park, where he's now waiting with his wife for a decision on his claim for US political asylum. "I want to try and to have rule of law, I want to try and have democracy, freedom, that's my ultimate goal... A change of the regime," he said in a recent exclusive interview. He's set a timeline of three years.

For several months, Guo has been flooding social networks with searing accusations of corruption against China's rich and powerful. Few Chinese tycoons choose dissent. But Guo, whose property was seized and two brothers imprisoned since he fled from China in 2014, says his campaign has been brewing for 28 years. Amid the crackdown on pro-democracy protesters on Beijing's Tiananmen Square in 1989, "my little brother died in front of me... I was detained for 22

It was in prison that he decided to "wrestle with this system under the Communist party that is inhumane, not democratic, unlawful." While some accuse the businessman, who is not shy about publicizing his ostentatious lifestyle, of hypocrisy in his allegations of corruption



among China's political elite, Guo denies accusations that he himself is also guilty of graft. "Why would I do this? I don't need the money, I have money," he said, ticking off possessions such as apartments in New York and London and a yacht, as well as "a wonderful family."

Flee or be eliminated

"But I am a Buddhist, I want to be kind to other people... I want to change the evil regime," said Guo, who gives his age as 47 despite uncertainty about his birthdate due to the upheaval of the Cultural Revolution in China at the time. "All the successful businessmen in China, there are only two fates for them: one is to flee the country, the other is waiting to be eliminated."

He chose to go on the offensive, posting unsubstantiated yet politically sensitive allegations. His Twitter account, which has nearly 480,000 followers, has been repeatedly blocked since China's Communist Party congress in October, he said. Undeterred, Guo has been developing a new media platform that he intends to launch before the end of December to expose the flaws of China's Communist regime.—AFP

N Korea's Africa friends face the test of loyalty

JOHANNESBURG: Old alliances between North Korea and several African nations forged at the height of the Cold War will not be swept away easily. While threats from the United States and UN sanctions have forced many governments on the continent to keep their distance from Pyongyang, the links are not yet confined to the past. For watchers of North Korean leader Kim Jong-Un's regime, the country's presence on the African continent is unmissable and the hermit nation continues to benefit from discrete but vital relations. Statues and Stalinist-style palaces of questionable aesthetic value made by North Korean artists have sprung up in many cities including Dakar, Windhoek, Maputo, Harare and Kinshasa.

But cooperation between the regime and African governments goes much further than construction projects. Experts estimate that economic ties between Africa and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) are worth around \$200 million (85 million euros) annually. Minerals and fishing top the league table of exports, closely followed by North Korea's most controversial output-arms. Despite sanctions levied by the UN in 2006 in response to its nuclear weapons program, North Korea's military cooperation with its allies on the continent is strong.

Military hardware

"A number of countries appear to maintain close relationships with the DPRK," said Graham Neville, an analyst at the London-based international affairs thinktank Chatham House. "More than half of the countries in Africa-around 30 — engage in some form of trade with the DPRK." Arms sales, which are strictly prohibited by the terms of the sanctions, have drawn the ire of the international community. UN experts have accused 11 African countries of seeking closer military ties with Kim Jong-Un's regime in a report published in September. According to the document, North Korea has agreed to supply light weapons to Eritrea and Democratic Republic of Congo, surface-to-air missiles to Mozambique, modern missiles or radar systems to Tanzania and to train security forces in Angola and

The authors probed two North Korean companies active in Namibia-Mansudae Overseas Project and Komid-which constructed the new headquarters of Windhoek's spy agency, as well as a munitions factory. Pyongang's largesse should come as no surprise. Since Africa's wars of liberation, North Korea has sought to befriend Marxist regimes on the continent. "During the Cold War, North Korea gained a reputation for providing useful training for African militaries," said Samuel Ramani, an Oxford University specialist on the world's most reclusive nation.

In the most notorious case, Zimbabwe's president Robert Mugabe called in North Korea to train the infamous Fifth Brigade, which is accused of killing around 20,000 minority Ndebeles in the 1980s. Kim Jong-Un's provocative run of missile tests and nuclear experiments have finally persuaded some of Pyongyang's African backers to step back. Sudan has cut ties with the DPRK, while Uganda expelled North Korean military advisers and pledged to enforce the latest round of sanctions. Tanzanian foreign minister Augustine Mahiga said recently that the country "had scaled down diplomatic relations to the minimum."—AFP

New protests flare over US Jerusalem...

Dozens of students protested at two other Cairo universities. Palestinian protests yesterday were smaller than in previous days. Protests and clashes broke out in Al-Arroub refugee camp in the south of the occupied West Bank, leaving one Palestinian wounded by rubber bullets, the Palestinian health ministry said.

A few dozen Palestinians in Bethlehem, also in the West Bank, burned tyres and threw stones at Israeli soldiers, who fired tear gas. Separately, the Israeli military said it destroyed a Hamas tunnel stretching from the Gaza Strip into Israeli territory - an incident unrelated to the recent unrest, but which threatened to further increase tensions. Such tunnels have been used in the past to carry out attacks. Trump's declaration has been followed by near universal condemnation and diplomatic fallout, with warnings it risks setting off a new round of violence in the turbulent Middle East. US Vice President Mike Pence is due to visit the region later this month, but Palestinian officials say president Mahmud Abbas will refuse to meet him. Arab League foreign ministers on Saturday called on Washington to rescind the decision. Despite the outrage, Trump's UN Ambassador Nikki Haley insisted yesterday that the Jerusalem declaration would "move the ball forward" on peace efforts.

Netanyahu's Europe trip was long planned, but came after both Macron and EU diplomatic chief Federica Mogherini criticized Trump's decision. There have also been ongoing tensions between Netanyahu and EU offi-

cials over Israeli settlement building in the West Bank. Macron called on the Israeli leader to freeze settlement building during their talks yesterday and to show "courage" to help restart peace efforts.

Speaking at their press conference, Netanyahu again lauded Trump's Jerusalem recognition and called the White House's bid to restart peace efforts with the Palestinians a "serious effort". He welcomed Macron's condemnation of attacks against Israel after on Saturday criticizing European "hypocrisy" over condemnation of Trump's declaration, saying rockets from Gaza should also be criticized. Netanyahu was to travel to Brussels for talks with EU foreign ministers today in what would be the first of their kind with an Israeli premier in 22 years. Trump's decision upended decades of US diplomacy and broke with international consensus. It drew criticism from every other UN Security Council member at an emergency meeting on Friday. Clashes in the West Bank and along the fence dividing the Gaza Strip from Israel have seen Palestinians burning tyres while hurling stones

and firebombs at Israeli troops, who responded with tear gas, rubber bullets and live rounds. Retaliatory Israeli air strikes on Gaza in response to rockets killed two Hamas militants on Saturday while two other Palestinians died in clashes near the border fence the day before.

Palestinian health officials say more than 1,100 people were wounded by tear gas, rubber bullets, live fire and other means between Thursday and Saturday. There have been fears of a much larger escalation of violence after Hamas leader Ismail Haniya called for a new Palestinian intifada, or uprising. In Rome, Pope Francis called yesterday for "wisdom and prudence", asking world leaders "to avert a new spiral of violence".

Trump said his defiant move - making good on a 2016 presidential campaign pledge - marked the start of a "new approach" to solving the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. But Washington has found itself isolated on the global stage. Five European countries on the Security Council insisted the new US policy was inconsistent with past resolutions. — AFP

According to a ministerial decree issued by health ministry, the new health fees for expatriates for using services at public hospitals is now KD 10, and a stay in public wards costs KD 10 per day (which was completely free before). Expatriates in Kuwait are already required by law to pay an annual health insurance of KD 50 in order to renew their iqamas. This KD 50 health 'insurance' fee is still required despite the rise in fees at hospitals and clinics.

Also, a stay in the intensive care unit now costs KD 30 per day, while a stay in a private room at a public hospital is KD 50 per day with a KD 200 deposit. These fees do not include surgeries, laboratory tests and x-rays. Moreover, a medical checkup at the public maternity hospital now costs KD 10, while the delivery charge is KD 50, among others. A few days after the hikes, public hospitals recorded a 30 percent drop in the number of expatriate patients, Health Minister Dr Jamal Al-Harbi said, as expats shunned public hospitals and clinics.

Health insurers

Meanwhile, as public hospitals keep recording a decline in the number of patients, private hospitals and insurance companies in Kuwait are cashing in. Private hospitals and clinics in Kuwait have witnessed a sharp increase in the number of patients visiting their facilities since the government implemented the new fees. Several of those who spoke to Kuwait Times said some private hospitals, in the face of a sudden rush of patients, were forced to refurbish their infrastructure facilities and boost their workforce. This in turn brings more investment into the sector and creates more job opportunities, giving a new momentum to the healthcare segment of the private sector.

"I can say for certain that we have recorded at least a 25 percent rise in patient numbers since October 1. There is also a considerable spike in the number of visitors who come for medical tests such as blood tests, ECG, x-rays, ultrasound test, CT scan, endoscopy, colonoscopy, routine urine microscopy, urine cultural sensitivity tests, etc," said Yousef, an administrator at a private hospital. While admitting that the government decision is indirectly helping private medical facilities in the country, he declined to comment on a popular belief that the harsh move was initiated to aid private hospitals.

At a private hospital in Salmiya, Kuwait Times spoke to a young couple who just had their new baby. "We really thank God for the new baby. The hospital staff is nice and caring and the charges here are really affordable. Their services are better," said Rose, a European expat.

Insurance

Interestingly, medical insurance companies in the country have begun to see a windfall of opportunity in the perceptible shift of expat patients from government hospitals to private medical facilities. For expats, the exorbitant fees for healthcare services in the public sector have forced them to

seek medical services in the private sector, thanks to insurance companies. "I have to pay only 10 percent or 20 percent of the total charges for the services now, depending on the medication or tests I undergo and the rest is covered by my insurance company. This is manageable for many people like me," said Pulikeshi, an Indian expat who works in a pri-

Many like Pulikeshi are now covered by private health insurance companies who are tied with a vast network of healthcare providers consisting of all major hospitals, private clinics, laboratories and pharmacies in Kuwait. The private healthcare insurance market in the country is flourishing as a result of the shift of patients. In Kuwait, all major insurance companies are currently offering attractive health insurance products, setting the stage for fierce competition.

"For health insurers like us, this is the right time to cash in on the flow of patients to the private sector. For the next five years or so, the companies are going to bank on the opportunity. And once the impact of the settlements begins to feel, insurers could resort to reinsurance to spread liabilities," said John Abraham, a health insurance specialist. However, he predicted that after a period of 10 years, insurance companies may have to eventually incur losses unless the government brings in some drastic policy changes.

Usually, insurance companies divide the amount the policyholder pays by the amount he/she uses and multiply it by a number. Then they make assessments based on this figure and decide if they should increase the premium. Many companies also limit costs for a particular treatment within a calendar year, in addition to having an overall annual limit for all treatments.

The human dimension

Many expats and MPs have urged the government to reconsider the move - arguing that the average incomes of most of the foreigners working in the country cannot support the increase. "There is an urgent need to consider the human dimension and the average income of a large number of foreigners," MP Khalid Al-Otaibi said. MP Waleed Al Tabtabaei called for widening the scope of health insurance instead of raising medical fees. He suggested a clear health insurance scheme to help foreigners instead of resorting to higher medical fees.

On the other hand, some Kuwaiti lawmakers have launched aggressive media campaigns advocating against providing services to foreigners for free or at affordable prices. They argue that with the drop in oil prices, the country can no longer afford to foot the bill for the expatriate population, which constitutes more than two thirds of Kuwait's population.

Hospitals for expats

Meanwhile, the annual health insurance fees for expatriates will be increased to KD 130 as new hospitals and clinics that will exclusively serve foreign residents are being built. The Health Assurance Hospitals Company (Dhaman) last month inaugurated such a hospital in Ahmadi governorate in a groundbreaking ceremony. The hospital is one of the main components of the healthcare system for expatriates, which is implemented and managed by Dhaman as a leading development model for public-private partnership within the government's work program and development plan.

Dhaman CEO Dr Ahmed Al-Saleh said according to ministry decisions, health insurance for expats will cost KD 130 annually. Over two million expats working in the private sector and that their families will benefit from the Dhaman health services in various governorates. Two additional hospitals will be built in Farwaniya and Jahra, in addition to 12 medical centers, which will reduce crowding at public hospitals and primary healthcare centers.

Kuwait looking into importing Iraqi natural gas

The entire process will be done in phases, and Kuwait agreed on importing 50 million cubic feet of gas, said the minister, adding that the second phase will involve imports of 200 million cu ft for a period of a decade. On Thursday, Marzouq laid the cornerstone of Al-Zour Refinery, a project designed to process heavy crude oil, which will have an impact on the country's economy. Gas installations in Al-Zour will cover the country's needs for the resource for up to 30 years, said the minister.

Marzouq said the international crude market is expected to rebalance in the fourth quarter of 2018 after producers extended a deal to curb output. He also said oil prices would maintain at "current levels". Producers from OPEC and non-OPEC members agreed on Nov 30 to extend a deal to cut output by 1.8 million barrels per day (bpd) until the end of 2018. The producing nations aim to reduce an oil supply glut that sent crude prices crashing. As a result of the curbs, oil prices have doubled since dipping under \$30 a barrel

in early 2016. Marzouq said OPEC would hold a crucial meeting in June to "review the production cuts deal... and the possibility of preparing a study to exit the output curbs". A Kuwaiti-chaired ministerial committee monitoring the market and compliance of the cuts would hold meetings every two months to assess the situation, the minister said.

Marzouq touched on proceedings within OAPEC, revealing that the UAE will hold the presidency next year, while the next meeting of the organization will be held in Kuwait in Dec 2018.

Iraqi Minister of Oil Jabbar Al-Luaibi affirmed that both countries are in the final stages of the agreement to export natural gas from Iraq to Kuwait. An Iraqi delegation will arrive in Kuwait next week to put the final touches on the accord, revealed Luaibi. On his prediction for the global price of oil, the Iraqi minister said it might hover at \$60 per barrel. He touched on his country's production, saying that Iraq produced around 4.3 million barrels per day. Luaibi hoped that production would reach five million bpd by the second half of next year.

With regards to the Iraqi-Iranian accord signed yesterday, Luaibi said that Iraq will export around 30 to 60 million bpd to Iran and the Iranians will export a similar number of barrels to Iraq. The minister also indicated that Iraq had a memo signed with British Petroleum (BP) to evaluate Kirkuk oilfield, adding that the Iraqi side is eager to increase production by 700,000 bpd. The OAPEC meeting came as the Kuwait-based regional bloc celebrates its golden jubilee five decades after its inception in 1968.

The sources added that pressure from the Mutair tribe to appoint one of them led to last-minute changes, and Fahd Al-Afasi was appointed minister of justice and awqaf. Jabri has been appointed information minister - replacing Sheikh Mohammad Al-Abdullah Al-Sabah - after Sheikh Thamer Al-Jaber declined the portfolio and preferred to remain as Kuwait's ambassador to Saudi Arabia, especially after the ruling family nominated Sheikh Basel Al-Sabah as health minister to replace the nominee Fahd Al-Ibrahim, who placed several conditions to accept the post.

Moreover, the sources said that with support from the Kuwait Chamber of Commerce and the liberal bloc, Hind Al-Sabeeh retained her portfolios as minister of social affairs and labor and minister of state for economic development.

The Cabinet includes nine new faces including the ministers of oil, finance and public works, which means that the new Cabinet has almost a new economic team. Finance Minister Anas Al-Saleh has been given the state minister for Cabinet affairs portfolio and replaced by Nayef Al-Hajraf, a former finance minister and the current head of the Capital Markets Authority, the sources said.

Accordingly, the proposed Cabinet is expected to include: Sheikh Nasser Sabah Al-Ahmed as first deputy

PM and minister of defense; Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled as deputy PM and foreign minister; Sheikh Khaled Al-Jarrah as deputy PM and interior minister; Anas Al-Saleh as deputy PM and minister of state for Cabinet affairs; Bakheet Al-Rasheedi as minister of oil and minister of electricity and water; Hamed Al-Azmi as education minister; Hossam Al-Roumi as minister of public works and municipal affairs; Fahd Al-Afasi as justice and awgaf minister; Adel Al-Kharafi as minister of state for Assembly affairs; Nayef Al-Hajraf as finance minister; Sheikh Basel Al-Sabah as health minister; Mohammed Al-Jabri as information minister; Jenan Bushehri as housing and services minister; Khaled Al-Roudhan as minister of commerce and industry and Hind Al-Sabeeh as minister of social affairs and labor and minister of state for economic development.

A number of lawmakers immediately criticized the new Cabinet as the names were leaked out, with MP Omar Al-Tabtabaei saying that the new oil minister was being selected to maintain control over the oil sector and not based on competence and programs. MP Riyadh Al-Adasani said the prime minister still has time to rethink his Cabinet lineup, expressing dissatisfaction with some faces.


In another development, the National Assembly could not hold a special session yesterday to debate national reconciliation and the jailing of 67 opposition activists including MPs. Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanem told the Assembly that he was notified that the government will not attend the session. Only 26 lawmakers, well short of the required quorum of 33 MPs, attended the session. A number of lawmakers strongly lashed out at the government and "its lawmakers", and insisted they will try again to hold the session.

Hirscher wins Val d'Isere slalom

VAL-D'ISRE: Austrian Marcel Hirscher called on all his experience to master incredibly tough conditions and deliver a fastcharging second run to snatch victory in the World Cup slalom in Val d'Isere yesterday. Starting in eighth position in the second run, during which the top 30 from the first run start from the slowest up, six-time World Cup overall champion Hirscher clocked the second fastest time of 52.39sec for a winning combined total of 1min 41.94sec.

It was the 28-year-old Hirscher's 47th victory on the circuit and 21st in the slalom, the most technical discipline skiers tackle, and a perfect confidence booster just under two months away from the Winter Olympics in South Korea.

'We made a little adjustment (for the second run) and obviously it worked, it felt much better so thanks to the whole team," Hirscher said. "It was very tough, I've never seen so much snow in one hour. We're just thankful we could race today," he said, praising the course workers for tirelessly clearing the course. Hirscher, who made his comeback last month after being out of action with a fractured ankle sustained in August, was understandably thrilled with his victory.

"The results are pretty good!" he said, admitting to now feeling extremely nervous despite his experience.

Before the race I was really nervous because I've missed so many training days... I get so nervous before races, 'Am I ready for this or not?', so many questions. "Every turn makes you stronger."

Norway's Henrik Kristoffersen, slalom winner in Val d'Isere in the last two seasons ahead of Hirscher, claimed second, 0.39sec adrift of Hirscher and just one-hundredth of a second ahead of third-placed Swede Andre Myhrer. First run leader Stefano Gross of Italy could only finish sixth, at 0.76sec. Earlier, American skier Lindsey Vonn pulled out of yesterday's super-G in St Moritz after sustaining a back injury 24 hours previously. With less than two months to go before the Winter Olympics, Vonn said: "Unfortunately I will not be able to race today. I am extremely disappointed but my biggest goal this season is the Olympics and I need to take care of myself now so I can be ready for next week, and more importantly, for February. As always, thank you for the

Her tweet ended with icons of a red heart and hands in prayer. Vonn explained overnight that she had suffered an "acute facet (spinal joint) dysfunction". "I got compressed on the 6th gate and my back seized up. Rested and had a lot of therapy tonight." She added: "Our @usskiteam doctor checked me out and no imaging is needed, just need the joint and the muscles to calm down so I can move again." —AFP

Lomachenko retains title as Rigondeaux quits after six

NEW YORK: Vasyl Lomachenko continued his meteoric rise up the boxing ladder, retaining his WBO junior lightweight title Saturday night after challenger Guillermo Rigondeaux guit on his stool after six rounds. The 29year-old Lomachenko was awarded the victory when Rigondeaux elected not to come out for the seventh round in the first world title professional showdown between two multiple Olympic gold medal winners.

The outclassed Rigondeaux becomes the fourth straight boxer to quit mid-fight against Ukrainian Lomachenko. "Maybe I should change my second name, now my name is 'No Mas Chenko'," Lomachenko joked in the ring, referring to Roberto Duran when he threw in the towel against Sugar Ray Leonard in 1980.

Lomachenko improved to 10-1 as he handed the Cuban defector the first loss of his career in front of a crowd of 5,100 at the Madison Square Garden Theater. Lomachenko humiliated Rigondeaux, using his size and hand speed to dominate every round except the first.

He grew increasingly frustrated with Rigondeaux's tactics which included low blows and more clutching and grabbing than throwing punches. Lomachenko landed 55 punches overall while Rigondeaux landed just 15. Rigondeaux, who was booed loudly after the fight, looked the much smaller of the two fighters as the 37-year-old moved up two weight classes to challenge for the title. Rigondeaux (17-1) said after the fight that he hurt his hand in the second round and that was the reason he couldn't go on.

"I lost, but it was because of my hand," he said. "In the second round I injured the top of my hand and I could no longer continue." It marked the first time double Olympic gold medal winners battled for a world title as pro-

Lomachenko, who won gold in the 2008 and 2012 Olympics, has rocketed to the top of

Lakmal leads rout as S Lanka romp home against India

DHARAMSALA: Sri Lanka pace bowler Suranga Lakmal helped them steamroll India by seven wickets in the first one-day international in Dharamsala yesterday. The 30-year-old claimed four wickets for 13 runs in his impeccable 10 overs, which included four maidens, as the tourists bundled out India for 112 in 38.2 overs at the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association Stadium.

India were reeling at 29-7 in the 17th over before Mahendra Singh Dhoni struck a belligerent 65, with the former captain contributing more than half of the team total. Sri Lanka's top order were not completely convincing against the moving ball but Upul Tharanga's breezy 49 helped them chase down the small target with nearly 30 overs to spare and go 1-0 up in the

Smarting from their 1-0 loss in the preceding test series, Sri Lanka opted to field against an Indian team led by Rohit Sharma in the absence of regular skipper Virat Kohli who has been rested ahead of the team's imminent tour of South Africa. India got off to a terrible start losing Shikhar Dhawan, one of their five scoreless batsmen in the match, in the second over which triggered a spectacular collapse. Angelo Mathews, an allrounder who has been reduced by injury to an occasional bowler, dismissed Dhawan leg-before and Lakmal sent back Sharma caught behind for two in the fifth. On both occasions, Sri Lanka used the review option to overturn the original not out decisions. The double blow completely unhinged India, who lost the top half of their batting order to score their first 16 runs.

Southee, Boult dominate for N Zealand as Windies stutter

HAMILTON: Tim Southee and Trent Boult took centre stage with bat and ball as New Zealand seized command on a rain-affected day two of the second Test against the West Indies in Hamilton

They shared a 61-run last wicket stand to get New Zealand up to 373 in their first innings. The new ball pair then took four wickets between them on a benign pitch as the West Indies plummeted to 215 for eight at stumps. Southee has two for 34 and Boult two for 67. Raymon Reifer on debut was not out 22 with Miguel Cummins on 10. Southee, unavailable for the first Test, capped his day with a stunning catch to remove Kraigg Braithwaite, the West Indies' top scorer with 66.

The 1.93 metre (6ft 4in) Southee leapt to get a hand to block an edge off Colin de Grandhomme, and then dived to get a hand under the ball just as it was about to hit the ground. Play was interrupted for nearly 90 minutes by rain when the West Indies were 87 for two with Brathwaite and Shai Hope laying the foundations for a solid partnership.

But when play resumed, 20 minutes after the scheduled tea break, Hope only lasted six more balls before he was gone to end a 44-run stand and put the tourists into a tailspin that saw six wickets fall in the final session. They included Sunil Ambris, out for two when he stepped back onto his stumps for the second time in only his third Test innings. Bowler Boult shook his head and said "unbelievable" as Ambris hung his head and trudged back to the pavilion. Southee struck first in the opening over of the innings, taking the wicket of Kieran

Powell without scoring, and Boult caught and bowled Shimron Hetmyer for 28.

FLEETING HOPE

Hope reached 15 off four scoring shots-two fours, a six and a single-when he was caught at first slip to give Southee his second wicket. Roston Chase had no sooner brought up his 1,000th Test run than he was bowled by de Grandhomme with a ball that straightened and slipped between bat and pad. Brathwaite was dropped on 14 by Tom Latham and an edge on 47 fell just short of Ross Taylor at first slip before being dismissed by a phenomenal piece of fielding from Southee.

The stand-in Calypso captain faced 116 balls and hit nine fours and a six. Shane Dowrich had the second best score for the West Indies with 35, which included seven boundaries. New Zealand had resumed the day at 286 for seven and lost Neil Wagner for one and Tom Blundell for 28 early before Southee and Boult opened up. Mixing classic strokes with unorthodox cuts and pulls, Southee faced 39 balls for his 31 which included two sixes and a four. Boult had two sixes and five fours in his 37 off 27 deliveries. — AFP

LIVERPOOL: Wayne Rooney scored his first goal in a Merseyside derby as his late penalty earned Everton a 1-1 draw with Liverpool yesterday. Liverpool had taken the lead in the 229th meeting of the old rivals when Mohamed Salah spectacularly curled a shot home just before half-time, but the Reds were unable to find a killer second goal at Anfield.

Everton kept their discipline and refused to wilt and were awarded a spot-kick after Dejan Lovren barged over Dominic Calvert-Lewin. Rooney, who rejoined his boyhood club from Manchester United in July, showed no nerves as he equalised with 13 minutes left.

Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp made six changes from the side which thrashed Spartak Moscow 7-0, including the surprise decision to leave Philippe Coutinho and Roberto Firmino on the bench. Dominic Solanke and Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain were selected ahead of the Brazilian duo while Andrew Robertson replaced Alberto Moreno at left-back.

The start was typical of a Merseyside derby; feisty tackles, misplaced passes, no chances taken with clearances booted into row Z if required. Liverpool looked to show the early attacking intent, with Salah and Sadio Mane on the ball frequently with an eagerness to run at Everton's defence. After 15 minutes the game settled, Liverpool monopolising possession with Everton's two

banks of four happy to sit deep and seek to frustrate the home side. SOUTHAMPTON: Olivier Giroud's last-gasp header salvaged a point for Arsenal in a 1-1 draw at Southampton yesterday as Arsene Wenger's side avoided a second successive Premier League defeat. Wenger's team appeared destined to follow last weekend's home loss to Manchester United with another setback when they trailed to Charlie Austin's third minute goal.

But France striker Giroud conjured a response with two minutes left when he directed Alexis Sanchez's cross past Fraser Forster shortly after appearing as a substitute. A single point, though, denied Arsenal the chance to climb into the top four.

Southampton can consider themselves unfortunate to have seen Austin's fourth goal in three starts cancelled out late on, but Mauricio Pellegrino's side have won just one of their last seven games.

After seeing his side ship two early goals in the United defeat, Wenger had demanded concentration from the start. Unfortunately for Wenger, it appears his words went unheeded. Per Mertesacker had been restored to the line-up in place of the injured Shkodran Mustafi. But the Germany international was left redfaced just two minutes into his return as he gifted Southampton the goal that allowed Pellegrino's side to control the first half. A poor clearance from Mertesacker conceded possession deep inside his own half and then

slipped as he attempted to make up for his mistake, allowing Dusan Tadic the time and space to pick out Austin's run into the box where the striker finished from 12 yards out. It was the perfect start for the home side and they should have been two up inside five minutes when Tadic and Austin again combined to open up the unconvincing Gunners backline.

This time Tadic delivered a through ball from near the halfway line, sending Austin into space with a clear run on goal, but the forward placed his shot too close to keeper Petr Cech who was given the chance to save.

Arsenal looked vulnerable to every early Southampton attack and the satisfaction that followed Thursday's 6-0 Europa League defeat of BATE Borisov was quickly forgotten.

Theo Walcott and Jack Wilshere had both impressed in that win but Wenger adjudged that neither had done enough to force their way into his starting line-up. Wilshere in particular had cause to feel hard done to with Granit Xhaka making little impression in the central midfield areas as Arsenal fought to get back on level terms. In fact most of the visitors' first half opportunities came on the break, and in particular when Alexis Sanchez controlled a Southampton corner inside his own area and led a sweeping attacking move that was halted by Pierre-Emille Hojbjerg's saving tackle as Alexandre Lacazette made to shoot.

And when Aaron Ramsey did manage to fire off a shot towards Forster's goal a first time effort from Sanchez's 32nd minute cross - the Southampton keeper reacted superbly to dive low to his left after push the ball beyond the post. Iran eyes major economic growth next year

Rouhani presents conservative 2018 budget as US tensions cloud economy

TEHRAN: Iran's President Hassan Rouhani promised high economic growth as he laid out next year's budget yesterday, despite uncertainty over whether the United States will pull out of the nuclear deal.

Rouhani proposed to parliament yesterday a conservative state budget of about \$104 billion for next year, with the outlook for the economyand state revenues clouded by tensions with the United States.

Presenting the budget to parliament, Rouhani said overall economic growth would hit 6.5 percent in the fiscal year starting in March 2018, and seven percent with the oil sector excluded. Significant economic growth was a cornerstone of Rouhani's campaign when he was reelected in May. The government has also forecast 6.5 percent growth

ernment has also fore-cast 6.5 percent growth for this year but other estimates have been less optimistic. Parliament's research centre has said Gross Domestic Product will grow by only 3.9 percent this year, while the International Monetary Fund forecasts 3.5 percent in 2017, 3.8 percent in 2018 and four percent in 2019. Rouhani's first term from 2013 to 2017 was marked by the conclusion of the nuclear agreement with world powers in July 2015, which the president vowed would boost the economy by ending Iran's

international isolation. But major economic improvements have yet to materialize, with foreign investments limited due to fears of US President Donald Trump abandoning the nuclear deal and the return of the economic and financial sanctions that were lifted under the accord. Unemployment remains high and the IMF estimates it will reach 12.7 percent for 2017. It also says inflation may hit double digits this year as the rial slides

against the US dollar.

Rouhani announced a draft budget for the Iranian year starting next March 21 of 3,681 trillion rials (\$103.9 billion at the official exchange rate), excluding the spending of state enterprises.

That is up about 6 percent from the budget plan for the current year, but since inflation is running at nearly 10

is running at nearly 10 percent, the budget extends the conservative fiscal policy which Rouhani introduced after taking office

In a speech broadcast live by state television, Rouhani described the budget as one that would work towards full employment, eliminating poverty and creating social justice.

After struggling for years under sanctions, Iran's economy picked up in 2016 after most restrictions

were removed under a deal with world powers on its nuclear program. Gross domestic product grew 12.5 percent last year, according to the International Monetary Fund.

But that leap in growth was almost entirely due to a surge in the oil sector as Iran became able to increase its oil exports; the rest of the economy, which is more important to the welfare of most Iranians, improved much less. The IMF projects growth of just 3.5 percent this year.

Unemployment, officially put at around 12.5 percent, is a major cause of public concern and Rouhani said in his speech that 840,000 people would enter the job market next year.

Rouhani is under pressure to boost economic growth and create jobs as his hardline opponents, who were against the nuclear agreement, say he has failed to improve living standards as much as hoped after the lifting of sanctions. US President Donald Trump, who has taken a hawkish approach towards Iran, has said Tehran's missile program should be curbed and wants to punish Iran over its roles in Yemen and Syria. Trump has also dealt a blow to the nuclear deal by disavowing Iran's compliance with its terms, and the US Congress may re-impose sanctions or impose new sanctions. This threat has deterred many foreign banks and companies from doing business with Iran.

As in past years, the draft budget shows spending and revenues in balance, although the actual result will depend on fluctuations in oil prices. Next year's budget assumes oil prices of about \$55 per barrel, Iranian news agencies reported, up from about \$50 assumed

for the current year's budget.

The total draft budget, including state enterprises, amounts to 11,949 trillion rials, according to the text of the proposed plan published by Iranian news agencies.

The draft budget has to be passed by parliament and approved by a clerical body that vets legislation before it becomes law. —Agencies

After Brexit, UK aims for trade deal with EU

LONDON: Britain is aiming to secure a comprehensive free trade deal with the European Union and wants it to be signed shortly after it leaves the bloc in 2019, Brexit minister David Davis said yesterday. After securing an initial agreement on Friday to move Brexit talks to a second phase, Prime Minister Theresa May is keen to start discussing future ties with the EU, and especially the type of trading agreement to try to offer greater certainty for businesses. But despite Davis striking a confident tone, EU officials say they will only launch negotiations on a legally binding treaty after Britain leaves and becomes a "third country", according to draft negotiating guidelines.

"It's not that complicated, it comes right back to the alignment point ... We start in full alignment, we start in complete convergence so we can work it out from there," Davis told the BBC's Andrew Marr show. "The thing is how we manage divergence so it doesn't undercut the access to the market," he said, describing his preferred deal as "Canada plus plus plus". The EU has been considering a post-Brexit free trade deal with Britain along the lines of one agreed last year with Canada. But the UK economy is nearly twice the size of Canada's and British officials have said that their current alignment with EU standards and much closer trading links with the continent give them scope for an even deeper relationship.

US Fed to hike interest rates as Trump tax cut looms

WASHINGTON: The US central bank is set to raise the benchmark interest rate this week, looking to get ahead of price increases that, though absent so far, are still expected to materialize.

It would be the third rate hike this year, and is overwhelmingly expected by economists and traders, and hinted at by policymakers, even though official data show inflation remains well below the Federal Reserve's two percent target.

With the world's largest economy growing and near full employment-confirmed by a strong November jobs report on Friday-the central bank has long been expecting to see signs of inflation in the pipeline.

And now a Republican plan nearing approval in Congress to slash corporate taxes offers a potential juice to the economy that could prompt the Fed to hike rates faster, economists say.

The Fed's forecast in September indicated three rate hikes were likely next year, but any increase in anxiety over fiscal policy and its impact on inflation could be reflected in the revised projections from policymakers that will be released at this week's meeting.

Since the rate-setting Federal Open Market Committee last met six weeks ago, economic data have seen ripples of distortion from the multiple hurricanes of late summer, including rebounds in home construction and industrial output, for example.

And a key measure of consumer inflation posted its first gain in nine months in Octoberthough this was partly driven by the cost of hotels and lodging, which rose as people left home to flee Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.

The Fed's latest nationwide survey of the economy also contained reports of rising prices and worker pay-just the thing the central bank watches closely.

But the underlying trends have not changed much: an economy humming along at near three percent quarterly growth, robust-but-slowing job creation and record low unemployment, accompanied by weak inflation and sluggish wage gains.

The absence of inflation has baffled Fed officials and led to a split among those who want to go slow, and those who want to hike more quickly before price increases hit the economy.

Fed governor Jerome Powell, President Donald Trump's pick to lead the central bank

starting in February, testified last month that the case for a rate hike was "coming together," in an unusually strong hint about the likely move this week.

But Chicago Federal Reserve Bank President Charles Evans, currently a voting member of the FOMC, questioned the need to raise rates again so soon, and said the central bank could simply sit on its hands "until the middle of next year."

Below three percent, impossible?How a massive tax cut that slashes corpo-

rate tax rates to 20 percent from 35 percent might change the outlook for the economy and inflation remains unclear as estimates vary widely. Much depends on the final details and when they take effect.

According to economists at Goldman Sachs, the version of the tax bill adopted by the Senate could boost growth by 0.3 percentage points over the next two years-before turning flat or even negative the following year. Ian Shepherdson of Pantheon Macroeconomics said tax cuts at full employment "make no sense" and could drive the unemployment rate to three percent.

"You might think that's impossible," he said in a client note, "but note that 108 metro areas... already had sub 3.5 percent unemployment rates in September." —AFP

Venezuela in new defaults on two bonds, says S&P

Country failed to make \$183 million coupon payment

CARACAS: Crisis-wracked Venezuela has defaulted on two bonds, failing to make a \$183 million coupon payment, ratings agency S&P said Friday. The agency said OPEC-member Caracas failed to make the payment within a 30-day grace period on global bonds due in 2023 and 2028

The grace period expired Friday. "In line with our criteria for timeliness of payments, we are lowering the issue ratings on these bonds to "D" from "CC," the agency said.

Falling oil prices and corruption have decimated the economy under socialist President Nicolas Maduro, leading to

hyperinflation and chronic food and medicine shortages in the oil-rich but cash-poor South American nation. Maduro is under fire internationally for marginalizing the opposition and stifling independent media. Earlier this year, 125 people were killed in several months of violent protests against his rule.

Despite this, Maduro is set for the latest in a sweep of poll victories in mayoral

elections on Sunday, with the main opposition parties boycotting the polls and showing little sign they can prevent his re-election next year. Next year's presidential election is scheduled for December, but some experts believe it could be brought forward to March.

Global ratings agencies already had declared Venezuela and state-owned oil company PDVSA to be in "selective default" due to late payments on multiple bond issues.

PDVSA is Venezuela's primary source of income. Key bosses at the oil company have been sacked and arrested on corruption charges in what analysts see as a purge by Maduro to consolidate power ahead of next year's elections. Newly-installed oil minister Manuel Quevedo, a former general, told reporters recently that oil production at PDVSA had been sabotaged as a preamble to a coup attempt. Although it sits atop the world's biggest oil reserves, Venezuela is struggling under an estimated debt burden of \$150 billion. S&P on Thursday said the worsening financial and social crisis in the country had put the credit of Venezuela's US-based oil company Citgo at risk.

The ratings agency put the ratings of Citgo Holdings and Citgo Petroleum on "CreditWatch with developing implica-

In the wake of the gov-ernment and state oil company PDVSA defaulting on debt payments, S&P put the ratings of Citgo Holdings and Citgo

Petroleum on "CreditWatch with developing implications." The move indicates a ratings move is likely in the next 90 days. And while Citgo's debt is graded separately from its parent company, S&P cited "heightened uncertainty regarding the separation between CITGO" and PDVSA.

And while it is possible the situation will develop favorably for Citgo's "B-" debt rating, "we believe that it is somewhat more likely to be negative than positive." Sudan curbs imports to support currency

KHARTOUM: Sudan has imposed a temporary import ban on selected foods and other items in an effort to protect its currency and narrow its budget deficit after the end of US trade sanctions in October, the government said. The Sudanese pound has been weakening against the dollar since Washington lifted 20-year-old economic embargo, paving the way for traders to step up import volumes and putting pressure on already scarce hard currency. The central bank holds the official exchange rate at 6.7 pounds to the dollar, but a low supply in formal channels have meant traders have had to rely on Sudan's black market for dollars. Meat products, fish and fresh produce were among the 19 items included in the temporary ban the trade ministry signed, according to a statement released late on Saturday. The ban was effective Dec 7, the day it was signed.

Egypt's annual urban inflation falls to 26%

CAIRO: Egypt's inflation in November fell to a 2017 low a year after the country floated its pound currency as part of a \$12 billion International Monetary Fund deal to boost the economy. Inflation has shot up since the pound's flotation last November, reaching a record high in July on the back of energy subsidy cuts, but has gradually eased since. Annual urban consumer price inflation eased to 26 percent in November from 30.8 percent the previous month, official data showed yesterday. Core inflation, which strips out volatile items such as food, fell to 25.53 percent from 30.53 percent. The central bank has raised key interest rates by 700 basis points since the pound float, but economists see it cutting them in its monetary policy meeting later this month amid a continuing easing of post-float inflationary pressure. Egypt's finance minister said yesterday that he expected inflation to reach 20 percent by January and 13-14 percent by August. Chinese electric

With new internet rules set for vote, firestorm won't die

WASHINGTON: US regulators are gearing up for a vote on a plan which-depending on your viewpoint-would "restore internet freedom" or, alternatively, result in "the death of the internet" as we know it. The Federal Communications Commission will consider a rollback of its 2015 order aimed at enforcing "net neutrality," or the notion of treating all data and content providers equally.

FCC chairman Ajit Pai last month unveiled the plan, the latest twist in a dispute over more than a decade, with both sides claiming to promote a "free and open" internet.

The plan, widely expected to be approved on a 3-2 party-line vote Thursday, would reverse the rules adopted two years earlier which ban broadband providers from blocking or throttling rivals, or using "fast" and "slow" lanes for different services.

Pai, named chairman by President Donald Trump, said the 2015 rules "depress investment and innovation." Critics of the existing rules say they rely on 1930s-era rules for telephone companies, which could in theory lead to price regulation and other burdens.

But net neutrality backers argue that the rollback will enable internet service providers (ISPs) to shut out rivals that compete with their services or those of partners. They point out that some ISPs in the past have tried to force users to their own search engines, or block online calling services such as Skype or Vonage, or require a premium for Apple's FaceTime video calling.

The Pai proposal "will lead to a dramatic transformation of how the internet works," said Sarah Morris, who heads the New America Foundation's Open Policy Institute. "Internet service providers as gatekeepers have a lot of incentives to engage in shenanigans. The threats to our ability to navigate the internet and go to every corner of it are at risk" if the Pai plan is adopted, she told a conference on Tuesday.

Pillow in the face?

New York Times columnist Farhad Manjoo wrote that "the freewheeling internet has been dying a slow death"

and that the FCC actions "would be the final pillow in its face." Senior executive vice president Bob Quinn of AT&T, one of the large broadband firms which has lobbied and sued to block earlier FCC regulatory efforts, said apocalyptic predictions are wrong. "AT&T intends to operate its network the same way AT&T operates its network today: in an open and transparent manner," Quinn said in a blog post last month.

Michael Powell, head of the trade group for major broadband firms NCTA - The Internet & Television Association, said member companies have agreed to respect principles to "satisfy their customers' desire to visit any lawful website or run any lawful application."

But some are not mollified by these assurances, arguing that broadband is largely controlled by a handful of firmsincluding AT&T, Verizon and Comcast with little competition or consumer choice in many markets. "Why would they spend millions of dollars lobbying if they are going to treat everybody equally and not extract monopoly rents? asked Ed Black, president of the Computer & Communications Industry Association, which represents major tech firms.

"If they are allowed to build superfast lanes, they would cease to invest in the other lanes. It means everybody else is going to be left on the equivalent of dirt roads.'

The question of "paid prioritization," whether broadband firms can charge more for improved access, has been among the most hotly debated. Critics say broadband firms would be able to extort higher fees and limit access for new startups if the proposal is adopted.

But University of California economist Michael Katz

argues this is a basic business principal at work. "The logic of net neutrality would also argue for banning e-commerce sites from purchasing faster delivery from Fedex or UPS, or from offering free shipping," Katz said in a research paper. The net neutrality battle has been the subject of a series of court challenges over the past decade, and more litigation is likely unless Congress establishes clear guidelines.

Large tech firms like Google, Facebook and Netflix oppose the FCC draft rules, arguing that ISPs could effectively cut off or limit user access to some services. But with political and public sentiment shifting against Silicon Valley in recent months, Pai has turned the tables by blaming the large tech platforms for limiting consumer choice. "These providers routinely block or discriminate against content they don't like," Pai told a recent conference.—AFP

Maldives rushes through trade pact with China despite opposition

MALE: The Maldives government signed a free trade agreement with China during a visit to Beijing by its leader, Abdulla Yameen, it said, despite criticism from the opposition over the speed at which the deal was concluded. Under he deal - a document of more than 1,000 pages that the Maldives parliament signed off on last week after less than an hour of discussion - China and the archipelago nation will impose no tariffs on imports from each other. Fisheries are the main export from the Maldives, an Indian Ocean country of 400,000 that also relies heavily on tourism.

"The free trade agreement between China and Maldives signed during the visit was a milestone in the development of China-Maldives economic and trade relations," Yameen's official website said in a joint communique. The Maldives government also endorsed China's proposed Maritime Silk Road business development project, part of its vast Belt and Road infrastructure project.

China's state-run Xinhua news agency quoted Chinese President Xi Jinping as telling Yameen that the Belt and Road program matched up with the Maldives' development strategies.

President Yameen's government has had good relations with China since taking power in 2013. China has been striking deals with countries in Asia and Africa to improve its imports of key commodities and boost its diplomatic clout. The main opposition Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) said in a statement that the FTA contained technical details that should have been thoroughly reviewed and called for its implementation to be suspended until an independent feasibility study is conducted.

The government says the FTA will help diversify the \$3.6 billion economy and boost fisheries exports, crucial since the European Union declined in 2014 to renew a tax concession on them. Fisheries account for 5 percent of Maldives' economic output and earned the country \$140 million in 2016. The EU declined to extend the tax exemptions because the country has failed to comply with international conventions on freedom of religion, European diplomats in Colombo say. —Reuters

Brexit negotiations change gears; Dollar holds on to weekly gains

US economy upbeat, non-farm payrolls increase

KUWAIT: Last week in the United States, positive economic data indicated that the economy created more jobs than forecasted in November. Non-farm payrolls increased by 228K, compared to 200K expected by analysts. Gains in hiring are being partly attributed by the return to work of thousands of employees who had been temporarily dislocated by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma.

Meanwhile, data from the department of labor also pointed to a rebound in wages as average earnings rose 0.2 percent in November compared to a month earlier. This has elevated the annual increase in wages to 2.5 percent, up from 2.3 percent last month. In addition, the unemployment rate in the US economy remained at a 17-year low of 4.1 percent.

The data, which came at the end of the week, did little to change the upward direction of the US dollar at a time when it is being supported by an imminent inter-

est rate hike this month as well as progress regarding tax reform. The dollar had consistently drifted higher throughout the week as speculation mounted that the US House and Senate will reconcile their tax bills before the end of the year.

In Europe, Brexit negotiations between the United Kingdom

and the European Union have made "sufficient progress" as PM May and EU commission President Juncker both expressed optimism in an initial deal reached on Friday. The deal was made possible as a result of a compromise on both sides. However, while the EU stated that it has given ground, PM May conceded on all the main subjects, bringing to Brussels an offer on the financial settlement, an agreement on Europeans living in the UK and a solution to keep open the border that divides the island of Ireland after the split. This agreement will allow negotiations to transition into other topics, particularly trade negotiations and the nature of the post-Brexit future.

Despite the significance of such event, the FX market held an unusually muted response. Some analysts have claimed that the market was already long and was positioned for a deal despite the recent speed diminishing the uncertainty of the UK's future outlook as it parts ways with the EU after 40 years.

The Bank of Canada kept interest rates unchanged on Wednesday. The bank took a cautious tone even as it said more rate hikes are likely in store amid diminishing slack in the labor market and signs of inflation across the construction sector remained relatively

pressures. In addition, the central bank provided few hints as to when the next rate hike will come as chances of hike in January declined to 35 percent. As a result, the Canadian dollar had its worst week in nearly 4 months as the dovish central bank statement coincided with strong US dollar prospects. While the JSDCAD pair opened the week at a level of 1.2684, it closed 161 points higher at 1.2845.

With no major economic indicators released throughout the week with respect to the Euro, the single currency lost ground slowly but surely to the strength of the US dollar. While the EURUSD opened the week at 1.1880, it closed it lower at a level of 1.1765. Moreover, the Euro also lost ground to Sterling after an initial Brexit deal was struck. The EURGBP pair reached a near 6 month low of 0.8791 towards the end of the week.

A week of mixed economic indicators and specula-

tion ahead of late Brexit negotiations managed to intensify Sterling volatility. After reaching a December low of 1.3318, the pound managed to close the week higher at a level of 1.3388 against the US dollar.

The Australian dollar managed to rally during the beginning of the week after data indicated that retail sales in the

country bounced in October. However, weaker than expected economic data pressured the Aussie throughout the week causing it to close 1.17 percent lower at 0.7505. Regarding commodities, gold marked its worst week since May as it reached a low of \$1,243.71. Gold lost 2.7 percent of its market value this week as prospects of higher interest rates and progress regarding tax reform lifted the dollar. Meanwhile, the dollar had a similar, yet weaker, effect on oil prices as they dipped slightly towards the end of the week.

UK construction PMI

In the UK, the construction PMI, a leading indicator of economic health, reached a 5-month high. The solid figure was driven mainly by the residential sector as commercial and civil engineering activity continued to decline. Tim Moore, Associate Director at IHS Markit, which compiles the report, commented on plishment marks a major milestone that will aid in the report saying that "UK construction companies experienced a solid yet uneven improvement in business conditions during November. Once again, resilient house building growth helped to offset lower volumes of commercial work and civil engineering activity." Moore also added that "business optimism



subdued, but picked up from the near five-year low seen in October".

UK services PMI

Additionally in the UK, reports showed that consumer prices face the sharpest increase in prices charged by services firms in almost a decade as a range of businesses from hotels to IT companies seek to protect profits against rising costs since the EU referendum. Chris Williamson, Economist at IHS which compiles the report, commented saving that "the big news is in relation to prices, with the PMI surveys pointing to the largest monthly increase in average prices charged for goods and services since August 2008; a time when oil prices soared just before the global financial crisis. Rising oil prices were again to blame in November, with firms also reporting the need to pass higher costs of a wide variety of other inputs on to customers as a result of the weak pound having driven up import prices. As such, the survey data suggest that inflationary pressures have yet to peak."

Australian data

Solid economic data in Australia indicated that retail sales rose above expectations at 0.5 percent from the previous month, the strongest rise since May. Meanwhile, the Reserve Bank of Australia

decided to hold rates as expected, at 1.5 percent. The central bank indicated that it is no rush to follow the US, Canada, and the UK in raising rates as it continued to cite the outlook for household consumption as a source of certainty. "Household incomes are growing slowly and debt levels are high" added RBA Governor Lowe.

Despite a solid start to the week, further economic data from Australia indicated that the economy grew at a pace that is slower than expected by analysts. The GDP figure, which came in at 0.6 percent q/q, also showed that household spending rose at the weakest pace since the 2008 financial crisis, reinforcing the likelihood of the central bank keeping interest rates on hold for longer. The AUDUSD pair dropped around 46 points immediately following the release of the data.

Furthermore, data out of Australia revealed that Australia's trade surplus fell to its lowest level since December of 2016. The figure disappointed markets as it came in at \$0.11B, whereas analysts were expecting \$1.60B. The weakness in the trade balance surplus was also accompanied by exports falling 3 percent as imports rose by 2 percent.

Bitcoin futures launch sparks excitement, warnings

NEW YORK: Bitcoin was to make its debut on a major exchange yesterday, a landmark for the cryptocurrency that has generated enthusiasm among some investors and more than a little anxiety from others.

The Cboe Futures Exchange in Chicago was to open trading in bitcoin futures at 2300 GMT yesterday, a move that is expected to be followed a week later by a rival listing on Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

"Bitcoin bonanza takes hold of world markets," proclaimed the front page of the Times of London on Friday, reporting on the latest record price of the digital currency.

Among those cheering the launch are the Winklevoss twins, who have been called the first bitcoin billionaires. Critics include financial commentator Jim Cramer, who warns that prices could tumble once the new trading venues open the door to "short sellers," who bet on downward moves in assets.

The two launches were made possible after a key US regulator, the Commodities and Futures Trading Commission, gave the green light to the exchanges on December 1, while warning "of the potentially high level of volatility and risk in trading these contracts."

Anticipation of the first mainstream listings for the digital currency has been a catalyst for a sharp price increase in recent weeks. Bitcoin opened 2017 at around \$1,000, surged past \$10,000 for the first time last month and soared as high as \$16,777 on Thursday before retreating somewhat.

The actual opening of the Cboe market, an electronic trading venue, is expected to be a low-key affair, lacking the pomp of an initial public offering, which is often marked by the new entrant ringing the bell of the New York Stock Exchange.

"There won't be any ceremony, no champagne," said a person close to the Cboe process. "It's going to happen quietly, a switch flipping," the person added. "There are not going to be many people in



Going mainstream

The embrace by mainstream exchanges of bitcoin futures-a type of derivative contract that allows trading based on bitcoin's movement, without taking ownership of the currency itself-marks a sea change from the days when the digital currency was associated with drug dealing and other illicit activities. Still, plenty of key figures in and around markets are taking a cautious approach to bitcoin, which has no central bank backing it, and no legal exchange rate.

The Futures Industry Association, which includes some of the world's biggest derivatives brokerages, criticized the CFTC's move in a letter to the regulator, saying contracts are being rushed through without properly weighing the risks.

"A more thorough and considered process would have allowed for a robust public discussion among clearing member firms, exchanges and clearing houses," the association said.

Several leading financial heavyweights are still

studying bitcoin and not serving as financial intermediaries. This group includes JPMorgan Chase, Bank of America Merrill Lynch, Citigroup, Barclays, Morgan Stanley and Societe Generale, said people close to the matter.

Of the larger banks, only Goldman Sachs and ABN Amro are serving as intermediaries for the trades. That means most of the terrain will be dominated by smaller entities that are typically requiring larger than usual margin requirements-funds set aside as collateral in case of losses.

Wedbush Securities has lifted its margin requirements and is only permitting trades from clients on a "selected" basis, said Bob Fitzsimmons, a managing director for the firm.

'We are commissioning only the select clients who have experience in bitcoins," he said. "Our risk systems are ready and we have made sure we have our customers and firm protected by increased margins and increased scrutiny." —AFP

Argentina blocks two activists from entry on eve of WTO meeting

BUENOS AIRES: Argentina blocked two European activists from entering the country on the eve of the World Trade Organization's ministerial meeting in Buenos Aires, the two told a local radio program

Sally Burch, a British activist and journalist for the Latin American Information Agency, said Argentina had already revoked credentials given to her by the WTO to attend the meeting but thought she would be able to enter the country as a tourist.

"They found my name on a list and started asking questions ... supposedly I was a false tourist," Burch said on Radio 10. "It's not very democratic of Argentina's government."

Petter Titland, the spokesman for the Norweigan NGO Attac Norge, said authorities denied him entry without explaining why. Late last month, Argentina rescinded the credentials of some 60 activists who had been accredited by the WTO to attend the meeting because it determined they would be "more disruptive than constructive."

WTO meetings often attract protests by antiglobalization groups, but they have remained largely peaceful since riots broke out at the 1999 meeting in Seattle.

WTO's spokesman, Keith Rockwell, reiterated on Saturday that it disagreed with Argentina's decision to revoke activists' credentials. "We didn't have the same perspective but we're now moving on," Rockwell told journalists. Argentina's President Mauricio Macri has promoted business-friendly policies since taking office in December 2015, and Argentina will host global events as chair of the G20 group of major economies next year. —Reuters

Boursa Kuwait still a local market, Kuwaitis form largest trading bloc

Individuals largest contributors to liquidity

KUWAIT: Kuwait Clearing Company issued its report titled "Trading Volume According to Nationality and Category" for the period extending from 01/01/2017 to 30/11/2017 published on the official website for Boursa Kuwait. The report indicated that individuals still form the largest trading group and their share started to increase and they captured 49 percent of total value of sold shares (45.7 percent for the same period 2016) and 48.8 percent of total value of purchased shares (41.5 percent for the same period 2016). Individual investors sold shares worth KD 2.710 billion and purchased shares worth KD 2.697 billion with a net trading, selling, by KD 13.235 million. The second large contributor to market liquidity is the clients' accounts (portfolios) which captured 22.4 percent of total value of sold shares (18.3 percent for the same period 2016) and 20.9 percent of total value of purchased shares (15.9 percent for the same period 2016). The sector sold shares worth KD 1.240 billion and purchased shares worth KD 1.157 billion, with a net trading, more selling, by KD 82.842 million.

The third contributor, is corporations and companies sector which captured 21.4 percent of total value of purchased shares (33.3 percent for the same period 2016) and 20.9 percent of total value of sold shares (26.8 percent for the same period 2016). The sector purchased shares worth KD 1.182 billion and sold shares worth KD 1.156 billion with a net trading, purchasing, by KD 25.860 million.

The last contributor to liquidity is the investment funds sector which captured 9 percent of total value of purchased shares (9.3 percent for the same period 2016) and 7.7 percent of total value of sold shares (9.2 percent for the same period 2016). The sector purchased shares worth KD 495.110 million and sold shares worth KD 424.893 million, with a net trading, more purchasing, by KD 70.218 million.

Boursa Kuwait still continues to be a local bourse with more share for Kuwaiti investors forming the biggest trading group and sold shares worth KD 4.886 billion capturing 88.3 percent of total sold shares, (85.6 percent for the same period 2016), and purchased shares worth KD 4.783 billion capturing 86.5 percent of total value of purchased shares (86.4 percent for the same period 2016). Thus, their net trading, the only one selling, by KD 103.171 million, which is an indicator of the continued decline in confidence of local traders, despite the relative activity of the Boursa.

of purchased shares, scored 9.3 percent, (9.7 percent for the same period 2016), and purchased shares worth KD 512.475 million and sold shares worth KD 443.437 million, or by 8 percent of total sold shares (11.3 percent for the same period 2016); thus their net trading value, more purchasing, by KD 69.037 million.

GCC Investors' share out of total value of purchased shares scored 4.3 percent (3.9 percent for the same period 2016), worth KD 235.510 million, while value of sold shares scored 3.6 percent (3.1 percent in the same period 2016), worth KD 201.377 million, their net trading, purchasing, by KD 34.134 million.

Relative distribution among nationalities changed from its previous one and became as follows: 87.4 percent for Kuwaitis, 8.6 percent for traders from other nationalities, and 3.9 percent for GCC traders vis-‡-vis 86 percent, 10.5 percent and 3.5 percent for Kuwaitis, other nationalities and GCC traders respectively for the same period in 2016. This means that Boursa Kuwait remained a local one with the rise in the share of its investors from local traders. However, the turnout is still higher from investors mainly outside the GCC region than from the inside of the GCC region in which an overtrading of individuals is a dominant factor, who also increased their share with the increasing activity of the Boursa.

Number of active accounts between the end of December 2016 and the end of November 2017 rose by 9.6 percent, (compared to a decrease by -41.1 percent between the end of December 2015 and the end of November 2016). Number of active accounts in the end of November 2017 scored 17,101 accounts or 4.5 percent of total accounts versus 17,703 accounts in the end of October 2017, i.e. about 4.7 percent of total accounts for the same month, with a decrease of -3.4 percent during November 2017.


Comparative performance of selected markets

November's performance was inclined towards negative performance. During this month 9 markets achieved losses while 5 markets achieved gains. Losses outweighed gains. The number of winners from among mature and emerging markets was 2 only (out of 7 markets). Three markets achieved gains, while other four markets recorded losses in the GCC region. The losing markets increased during the 11 months, ie since the beginning of the current year, up to 5 markets from 4 markets as in the end of October. All 5 losing markets belong to the GCC

The biggest loser in November was Dubai market whose index lost in one month 5.9 percent which pushed it to the bottom of the negative zone with accrued losses since the beginone month despite the rumors about raising the interest rate in December and perhaps due to reducing corporate tax from 35 percent to 20 percent. It retained its position as the second biggest gainer since the beginning of the current year by 22.8 percent gain.

The second biggest gainer was the Japanese market by 3.2 percent gains and it was the biggest gainer in October by 8.1 percent gains. With the two months' gains the Japanese market surpassed the German's to the third gainer since the beginning of the current year by 18.9 percent gains perhaps as a result of the late elections which provided political stability supportive to the economic reform contrary to stumbling efforts in Germany to form a government. The third biggest gainer was Muscat market which was the biggest gainer in November among the 7 GCC markets. It added 2 percent gain in one month; nevertheless. It remained the biggest loser since the beginning of the current year by its index losing -11.6 percent since the beginning of the current year.

Predicting markets' future performance in December remains difficult. It has been customary from stock markets to be active in December even without a convincing justification. Their activity aims to achieve the best possible closures for their indexes in the end of the year in an attempt to influence the financial results for dealers at these stock markets. That may also be supported by better projections of economic growth for the emerging and mature markets. In the Gulf region, the trends are divided between improved oil prices as a positive



ning of the current year by 3.1 percent, although it was among gainers from the beginning of the current vear until the end of last October. The second biggest loser in November was the Oatari market which lost -5.5 percent in one month which increased its losses from the beginning of the current year to -26.1 percent to lie deep in the bottom of the negative zone. Bayt.com connects over 30m with their ideal firms and career opportunities online

KUWAIT: A new poll by Bayt.com, the Middle East's leading job site, entitled 'Preferred Work Arrangements in the MENA,' has revealed that nearly three-quarters (74.2 percent) of professionals in the region prefer to work for 'large or multinational' companies over 'small or medium-sized' companies (9.2 percent) or 'startups' (2 percent). Given that preferences for work arrangements have evolved to suit employees' changing priorities, this may be contributed to the perception of larger companies being better equipped to fulfill their employees' desires for

Nine in ten (90.5 percent) respondents agree that they mostly want to have full-time work, rather than part-time (1.9 percent) or freelance (1.9 percent) work. When asked about the reasons employees in the MENA region prefer full-time work, nearly half (48.3 percent) of respondents cited 'job security' as the key advantage, followed by 'better career growth prospects' (26.6 percent), a 'stable source of income' (15.7 percent), and 'greater ease in communicating and completing work'

But even with full-time employment, job seekers are on the lookout for flexibility. A large majority (85.9 percent) of MENA professionals said they prefer to work for a company that offers 'flexible hours'. Additionally, 79 percent said they prefer to work for a company that offers 'remote-work options'.

In fact, flexible hours is also the most frequently cited advantage of freelancing, according to two-thirds of professionals in the MENA. Other benefits of freelancing, according to respondents, are 'more independence and control over work' (16.5 percent), the ability to 'explore more career options' (14.2 percent), and 'more control over income' (2.5 percent).


Despite the perceived perks of freelance work, though, a large majority (84.4 percent) of MENA professionals prefer to have an employment contract with a specified duration when starting a new job.

In terms of priorities in choosing a job opportunity, four in ten (41 percent) respondents cite salary as the number one attribute they value. Meanwhile, nearly one-quarter (23 percent) value career growth and training the most, followed by passion and interest in the job itself (15.6 percent), job security (10.6 percent), and work-life balance (9.8 percent). And in considering the type of working environment they desire, nearly two-thirds (64.9 percent) of MENA professionals say they prefer to work indoors at a desk, while (14.5 percent) prefer to work outdoors at different sites. The remaining fifth (20.6 percent) has no preference on where they work.


When it comes to working beyond their prescribed schedules or duties, most employees in the MENA are willing to do so in exchange for appropriate compensation. According to the poll, nearly 9 in 10 (86.5 percent) respondents are okay with working overtime so long as they're compensated for it - and more than eight in ten (82.8 percent) respondents are okay with traveling if they are compensated for it. Further, more than three-quarters (76.4 percent) of MENA professionals say they are willing to relocate for employment, while less than a fifth (17.4 percent) say their willingness to relocate depends on the country, and only 6.2 percent are unwilling to relocate at all.

"As the job landscape changes in the face of employees' evolving lifestyles and priorities, so do preferences for work arrangements in the MENA region. Tech titans ramp up tools to win over children

SAN FRANCISCO: From smartphone messaging tailored for tikes to computers for classrooms, technology titans are weaving their way into childhoods to form lifelong bonds, raising hackles of advocacy groups. The debut this month in the US of a version of Messenger mobile application for children younger than 12 marked the first time leading online social network Facebook has stepped into the sensitive market.

California-based Facebook said Messenger Kids complies with regulations protecting children online, and offers more safeguards for youngsters.

Facebook said the new app, with no ads or in-app purchases, is aimed at 6- to 12-year-olds and does not allow children to connect with anyone their parent does not approve. Messenger Kids is being rolled out for Apple iOS mobile devices in the United States on a test basis as a standalone video chat and messaging app.

Product manager Loren Cheng said the social network leader is offering Messenger Kids because "there's a need for a messaging app that lets kids connect with people they love but also has the level of control parents want." Groups which monitor social media gave mixed reviews to the Facebook effort. "Ideally, young children should not really be subjected to this kind of environment," said executive director Jeff Chester of the Center for Digital Democracy, a consumer protection group. "(Messenger Kids) is the best we can do at the moment. The pressure on parents to

let their children be on these services is so strong." Facebook, meanwhile, is motivated to increase the ranks of people using its offerings and get a new generation in the habit of using the social network.

John Simpson of the activist group Consumer Watchdog argued a need for academic studies into how the use of technology affects children.

"Tech companies are not doing this out of generosity and kindness of the heart, they're doing it so they will build potentially loyal customers in the future," Simpson said. Two US senators wrote Thursday to Facebook with concerns about how children's personal data might be collected or used in Messenger Kids.

Tech invasion of schools

With Messenger Kids, Facebook gets children to spend time on the internet and social networks, said David Monahan of the Campaign for a Commercial-Free Childhood. He saw similar approaches from other tech giants, such as Google, which has spent years getting US schools to use its Chromebook devices for

connecting to cloud-based content and services. A Google for Education website aimed Chromebooks directly at classrooms, touting the devices as low-priced and easy to use. Chromebooks have become the most prevalent computing hardware in US schools, despite Apple starting years earlier in aiming its Macintosh machines at education.

Selling computers to schools at attractive prices, aimed at high-volume deals and becoming part of peo-

ple' lives at early ages, is not new. Apple, Microsoft, and HP have a history of it. But, Google has triumphed on this ground to the extent that the New York Times referred to the accomplishment in coverage as the "Googlification of Classrooms." Since Chromebooks act as portals to computing power and applications hosted online, Google gets the benefit of having students use its software for classwork, messaging and other services powered by the internet cloud. Google charges a one-time \$30 licensing fee per Chromebook, and claims that more than 20 million students use its devices in schools around the world.—AFP

Big media scrambles to meet challenge from Big Tech

WASHINGTON: America's media giants have seen this movie before: Big Tech enters an industry with piles of cash and new ways of doing business, devastating the competition.

That's why Big Media are scrambling for partnerships and tie-ups to bolster their content arsenal in the face of a wellfunded onslaught from the tech sector. This shifting landscape helps explain talks between Walt Disney Co. and 21st Century Fox to sell key television and film assets from the Rupert Murdoch family-controlled group, and a proposed AT&T purchase of media-entertainment powerhouse Time Warner.

More deals are likely as the industry adapts to a consumer shift to online, ondemand services like Netflix, and efforts by tech giants such as Facebook and Apple to jump into original content.

"It's an incredibly complicated game of musical chairs happening simultaneously," said Robert Thompson, who heads Syracuse University's Bleier Center for

Television and Popular Culture. "Everyone is trying to make sure enough content and people to keep making it for them."

'Game of Thrones'

The old model of hefty pay TV packages supporting the content creators is fading, and the struggle for power in the industry is now referred to by some analysts as a "Game of Thrones," a reference to the popular HBO series.

Streaming services like Netflix and Amazon have already disrupted the sector. According to a report by the investment firm Raymond James, 31 percent of Americans said their primary source of video was streaming services. About 32 percent of consumers have canceled or "traded down" to a less expensive package, and many young viewers rely entirely on Internet platforms for video, the report said.

Google-owned YouTube is also ramping up its original content offerings and Apple has reportedly created a \$1 billion war chest for its television service programs.

"It's more than taking away money and subscriptions. It's about viewership, eyeballs," said Bruce Leichtman of Leichtman Research Group, who follows media and Richard Greenfield, an analyst at BTIG

Research, says the established "legacy" companies are being forced to sell, diversify or "scale up" to compete against tech players. But Greenfield said Disney's plan to acquire Fox's stake in Sky TV and studio assets while gearing up for its own streaming offerings may not be enough.

Disney, which owns the ABC television

that when the music stops they have network along with ESPN sports channels, still appears wedded to "legacy distribution platforms," Greenfield said in a research note. With more consumers moving away from big pay TV bundles, "industry fundamentals are worsening by the

day," Greenfield writes. "At the same time the tech giants/platforms are flourishing and they are taking aim at consumer time spent with legacy media." Analyst Brian Wieser at Pivotal Research said the moves come amid concerns about eroding profits, and mergers can give the firms better scale.

'The pursuit of size allows for more cost efficiencies and a better negotiating position" for content, Wieser said.

Pipes and content

An AT&T-Time Warner deal would merge one of the largest distribution platforms-AT&T's pay TV and Internet service-with the media-entertainment conglomerate's HBO, CNN and other content channels, putting it on the same level as Comcast, a cable giant which owns NBCUniversal.

But the Trump administration's Department of Justice has filed an antitrust suit to block the AT&T deal, fueling concerns the move is aimed at punishing White House foe CNN.

The "vertical integration" of a company with content as well as "pipes" could present a formidable foe to the tech sector. And a plan by US regulators to end "net neutrality"-rules aimed at treating all online traffic equally-may force companies like Netflix and Amazon to pay more to deliver to consumers. With relaxed rules, firms like AT&T and Comcast may be able to use some of the same tools employed by Netflix and Facebook by garnering data on viewers for promotions and advertising, according to independent media consultant

"Right now if you are ABC, you have no idea who is watching your shows," Wolk said. Having better data "is probably the most important thing" for these media firms, Wolk said, adding that it allows for more efficient targeted advertising.

Thompson, of the Bleier Center, said that even as the industry faces disruption, content creators-writers, directors and producers-will have more choices and potentially more bargaining power.

"I think these new tech operations can disrupt the old legacy means of distribution, but they still have to make this stuff,"

While Big Tech has disrupted many industries, its roots come from a culture of math and engineering geeks who may not be adapted to the entertainment sector.

Wolk said Google-owned YouTube "bombed pretty badly" with most of its shows for a paid streaming service. "They didn't hire anyone with Hollywood programming experience and they underestimated the skill for this," he said.

Apple by contrast "made a smart move" by hiring entertainment executives, according to Wolk, and Facebook is pursuing a different strategy of finding "niche" programs for devotees of certain kinds of shows. ---AFP

France caught in war with wolves

Wolves are a fundamental element of our natural European heritage

S...DERON, France: Furtive, wily and the animal of fairy tales, wolves fascinate nature lovers, but they raise fears among French sheep breeders who are trying to save their flocks. Amid debate in France on a future policy towards wolves, the government is being asked to come to the aide of sheep farming. "In one night, we lost 10 percent of our flock," said Claire Lapie, 32, a breeder in Sederon in the picturesque southeast Drome department.

On the limestone hillsides dotted with shrubs, she has been raising sheep for three years with her companion Yann Rudant. "A wolf attack, we knew one day it would happen to us. We accept the idea of 'a share for the wolf', one or two sheep, but finding 15 sheep eaten, slaughtered or dying-it's a nightmare," says Lapie. For the young couple, who went into debt to acquire 150 sheep and build a vast sheepfold, they live in fear of new attacks.

Big bad wolf

Fear-as well as fascination-of wolves has historic roots fed by many children's stories, including famous versions by the Brothers Grimm and Charles Perrault. "When Charles Perrault wrote 'Little Red Riding Hood' in 1697, it was during the worst series of attacks by wolves with at

least 500 children killed each year," said Jean-Marc Moriceau, an historian of wolves in France. The grey wolf was wiped out in the country in the 1930s and only returned in 1992 via Italy-currently home to around 2,000 wolves-then into Switzerland and Germany.

Since the Bern Convention of 1979, the wolf has gone from public enemy to a protected species as "a fundamental element of our natural European heritage". In some countries, like Romania and Poland where there have always been wolves, people adapt to treat an attack on sheep "like an accident, like a flock that falls into a ravine", says Farid Benhammou, a specialist on predators. "But in the new zones of (wolf) colonization-in France and in some regions of Italy and Spain-there are major tensions."

On a wolf mission

In his four-wheel drive vehicle, environmental inspector Cedric Arnaud roams the foothills of the Alps of Haute Provence in southern France. His mission includes collecting hairs and excrement left by the wolves which allow researchers to determine their DNA and to classify them. Like his colleagues, in the month of August he also howls to the wolves to try, by listening to their responses, to

determine the number of wolf cubs born in the spring. All these elements, along with images taken in camera traps, enable France's national office of hunting and wildlife (ONCFS) to estimate the wolf population, currently at around 360, compared with 292 last year.

At the top of the food chain, wolves have a key role in maintaining the ecosystem, Yvon Le Maho, emeritus research director at the National Centre for Scientific Research told AFP.

"It has been amply demonstrated in the United States that an excess of deer in the protected reserves has led to a degradation of the environment." The example of Yellowstone national park in the western US is a case in point. In 1994, the authorities decided to reintroduce the wolf and since then the deer population has diminished, easing the pressure on the vegetation and causing other positive effects such as the return of certain insects and birds and less erosion, according to a 2007 study by the University of Oregon. But Le Maho adds that preserving wolves requires Europe-wide attention as some countries like Sweden allow hunting. Sweden regularly authorizes a hunting season, despite opposition from conservationists, although this year parliament set a quota of 22 wolves. — AFP

India faces painful move to cleaner energy

UNCHA AMIRPUR, India: Subedar Singh bears the scars of India's painful reliance on dirty power and its struggle to pay for the costly transition to the brave new world of solar and renewable electricity. Last year, the farmer walked into a field in his village and suffered 70 percent burns to his feet and ankles from an underground coal fire caused by a nearby power plant. Singh said he dragged himself out of the field and then fainted from the searing pain.

The people of Uncha Amirpur in the northern Uttar Pradesh state-east of the smog-afflicted capital New Delhi-discovered that a mix of water and coal used by the nearby NTPC Dadri power plant had accumulated under the field and caught fire. Some cattle died. Hundreds of millions of people in India are forced to live with the fallout of the dirtiest fuels-with the government blaming a lack of funds to pay for greener power. Money will be the key issue when about 100 countries meet in Paris tomorrow for the One Planet Summit organized by French President Emmanuel Macron. The meeting will focus on marshaling public and private funds to speed the move to a low-carbon economy. Developing countries say barely a tenth of the \$100 billion promised by the end of the decade under a 2010 deal has come in so far. "If more money is available, of course the (Indian) government is in a position to push renewable energy faster," energy analyst Narendra Taneja told AFP. "The pollutants accumulated over the decades, we didn't do that. It was the West and they should clear up those dues as soon as possible," said Taneja, a consultant to the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party.

India needs \$140 billion to reach Prime Minister Narendra Modi's ambitious target of installing 100,000 megawatts of solar power by 2022, according to Arunabha Ghosh, chief executive of the Council on Energy, Environment and Water, a New Delhi think tank. So far it has just 15,000 MW, less than five percent of the country's total generation capacity of 331,000 MW. — AFP






Niall Horan wants Justin Bieber charity single collaboration

It comes after Justin donated \$25,000 to the American Red Cross in aid of their relief efforts after Hurricane Harvey. Speaking in a video clip posted at the time: "Just looking at these photos from Hurricane Harvey. I just want to say that I am so sorry to all the families that have lost their homes, people that have lost their lives. I'm going to accept the Kevin Hart challenge and donate \$25,000 towards the Red Cross, and I love you guys in Houston. You guys are awesome, you guys are strong. I am so sorry this is happening."

She said: "I believe that naivety is a really powerful little gift-a powerful little gun in your pocket to take you to a certain stage. But fear... Fear is not a good thing." And Calvin Klein's chief creative officer, Raf Simons, shared the same view as Stella, as he believes people will only be successful if they "take risks and stand for change". Raf - who was recognized as the Designer of the Year title at The Fashion Awards - said: "I think the only way to succeed in fashion is to just keep doing what you believe and try to not be too manipulated by the industry's way of dealing with fashion.

Teng bong! Minority languages on the rise in Singapore

Kristang, which is among several minority languages in Singapore enjoying a new lease of life after a decades-long drive to encourage the use of English and Mandarin. "Teng bong, ozi nus prendeh sorti-sorti di tempu," the linguist told his eager students in the 500-year-old mish-mash of Portuguese and Malay-a greeting, and information that the class would be about the weather. A former British colonial trading post that has long been a melting pot of different cultures, Singapore has an ethnically diverse population whose ancestors mostly came from across Asia, principally China, India and the Malay archipelago.

On independence in 1965, Singaporeans spoke an array of tongues. English was common, but many used Chinese dialects, such as Hokkien, as well as Tamil from India, Malay and a smattering of more obscure languages. But authoritarian founding prime minister Lee Kuan Yew believed change was necessary to ensure a secure future for the tiny city-state, which had been thrown out of neighboring Malaysia following a brief and stormy union. He made the study of English compulsory in schools as he positioned the country as a global commerce and finance hub, as well as one other "mother tongue". For local ethnic Chinese, who today make up the majority of Singapore's population, it was usually Mandarin, as Lee had an eye on China's rise as

Controversial policy

The policy initially ran into opposition from ethnic Chinese, most of whom trace their ancestry to southern

China. Lee, who ruled Singapore for over three decades and died in 2015, described in his memoirs how he had to force the issue. "To emphasize the importance of Mandarin, I stopped making speeches in Hokkien," wrote Lee, who was ethnic Chinese, while most TV and radio broadcasts in Chinese dialects were also stopped.

Those restrictions still stand except in special cases, such as radio news broadcasts in Chinese dialects for senior citizens who struggle with Mandarin. Non-Chinese tongues, such as Kristang-spoken by descendants of Portuguese colonizers who arrived in what is now Malaysia in the 16th century and married localsalso faded. One thing that unexpectedly flourished was "Singlish", a local patois that mixes English with words



from the myriad tongues spoken in Singapore. It is still widely used, despite official efforts to discourage it.

In recent years however Singaporeans have started to take more of an interest in their ancestors' languages. As well as Kristang, efforts have been made by organizations promoting Chinese culture to keep

Hokkien alive. It is the Chinese dialect that is most common in Singapore but it has become less widespread, particularly among the young. Other minority languages enjoying renewed attention include Baba Malay, spoken by descendants of Chinese immigrants who married into the local Malay population, which mixes elements of Malay

and a Chinese dialect, and Boyanese, a language from a corner of Indonesia.

Reconnect with the past

Observers see a relaxation in attitudes towards the old languages in the city-state of 5.6 million, which has grown into one of the world's wealthiest and most stable societies. Most Singaporeans have already achieved an enviable level of English by international standards, lessening fears that focusing on other tongues will affect their English-speaking ability.

There has also been growing concern about losing touch with the past. Young Singaporeans' desire to revitalize the languages is a "form of root-tracing" while for the older generation it's due to a sense of nostalgia, associate professor Tan Ying Ying, head of linguistics at Singapore's Nanyang Technological University, told AFP. "Linguists working in Australia, New Zealand, and the US, have dedicated frameworks and systems to revitalize minority languages that are in danger of being extinct," he said. "In Singapore, while there is such no formal system in place, the sense that these languages need to be 'saved' is felt by the communities of speakers themselves."

The students learning Kristang-spoken in parts of the Malaysian city of Malacca as well as Singaporeattend classes led by Wong, 25, thrice weekly, and range from young professionals to senior citizens. One of the first to enroll in the class was Wong's grandmother, 81-year-old Maureen Martens, who lost touch with Kristang when she moved to Singapore from Malaysia in 1952. "This is supposed to be my language, my heritage," she told AFP, her eyes welling up. "I wish more people will learn it, especially people from my line like my grandchildren." — ÅFP

The hype reawakens: 'Star Wars' stages 'Last Jedi' premiere

from galaxies near and far hit the red carpet in the shadow of a giant AT-AT assault vehicle Saturday at the glittering world premiere of "Star Wars: The Last Jedi"-although one star almost didn't make it. John Boyega, who plays the heroic stormtrooper-turned-rebel Finn, had tweeted that he feared missing the big event because a snowstorm had gridlocked air travel out of Atlanta. "Trying to get back for the LA premiere! I actually NEED a pilot !!!" he lamented, before turning up in the nick of time for the big screening in downtown LA after managing to catch a flight.

"It's thanks to Poe Dameron, the best pilot in the galaxy!" he joked on the red carpet, referring to the rebel pilot who aided his escape in the previous film. He was joined on the red carpet by the rest of the all-star cast, including Daisy Ridley (Rey in the space saga) who arrived wearing a suitably shimmering dress decorated in stars. Hotter than one of Yoda's root leaf curries, the "Star Wars: The Last Jedi" is expected to cash in on 12 months of relentless hype with one of the biggest domestic opening weekends ever.

Thousands of guests lucky enough to get tickets were the first moviegoers in the world outside of the production to see the eighth installment of the blockbuster space saga. Director Rian Johnson introduced the movie by bringing onstage the cast, and paid an emotional tribute to the late Carrie Fisher, the iconic General Leia Organa in the series, who died last December. Moviegoers clapped throughout as she appeared onscreen, and rose for a standing ovation as the credits rolled.

Rapturous initial reactions

Lucasfilm has embargoed detailed reviews until 9:00 am Los Angeles time (1700 GMT) on Tuesday, but fans were quick to flood social media with rapturous initial reactions to the movie, the longest in the series at 153 minutes. "There aren't enough words to express how much I LOVED 'Star Wars: The Last Jedi. It is mind-blowing! I'm in geek heaven!" tweeted Jenna Busch, a writer for fansite LegionofLeia.com. "Star Wars: The Last Jedi' is so very different, exciting, surprising. So many emotions, so many amazing moments. Stay away from spoilers," added Peter Sciretta of entertainment portal slash-

The premiere came six days before the movie's general release in US theaters,

tormtroopers, droids and celebrities kicking off a run widely expected to be the most successful worldwide since 2015's "Star Wars: The Force Awakens." Experts are predicting an opening weekend domestic box office of around \$220 million, which would push it beyond "Jurassic World" (2015) into second place behind "Awakens" (\$248 million). The cast came together in LA with director Rian Johnson yesterday to build buzz for "The Last Jedi," which sees the return of the characters introduced in J.J. Abrams's first entry in the rebooted trilogy.

Gwendoline Christie, who plays stormtrooper commander Captain Phasma, put the continued relevance of "Star Wars" down to its foundational mythology of good versus evil. "I think it's because the world we live in is a changing and evolving place that it retains the simplicity of those elements," she said. "But it really resonates with what it is to follow your own human, dark, narcissistic tendencies, where that will take you."

'Dire situation'

Christie was joined at yesterday's by returning stars Ridley, Boyega, Adam Driver, Oscar Isaac, Andy Serkis, Domnhall Gleeson and Luke Skywalker himself-Mark Hamill. There were new faces too: Kelly Marie Tran as Resistance maintenance worker Rose Tico and Laura Dern, who plays Vice Admiral Amilyn Holdo. "The Last Jedi"filmed on the west coast of Ireland and at Pinewood Studios near London-marks the last appearance of Fisher, who died after already having wrapped her scenes.

Written by Johnson, "The Last Jedi" picks up directly where "The Force Awakens" left off, with Rey looking to Luke to teach her about The Force. It presages adverse times for the Resistance-prompting comparisons with the middle chapter of the original trilogy, "The Empire Strikes Back." Like Fisher and Hamill, Harrison Ford was a "Star Wars" mainstay as loveable rogue Han Solo-but the character is missing from the latest chapter, having been killed off. "There hasn't been a 'Star Wars' movie yet that has explored war the way 'The Last Jedi' has," said Boyega. "It's very messy. The categorizing of good and evil is all mixed together." "It's a dire situation, it's critical. The Resistance is on its last legs," added Isaac. "When you're trying to survive, the First Order's right on top of us, it is like war, where you've got to keep moving to try to survive. You feel the momentum of everything that happened in 'The Force Awakens' just pushing to a critical mass."—AFP

Get the 'post-Soviet' look: How Russian street style went global





Russian street style might not conjure up images of high glamour, but the look is making its mark on the global fashion industry, from the catwalk to the high street. In-demand Muscovite designers such as Gosha Rubchinskiy and Andrey Artyomov have brought "post-Soviet" style to Paris, London and New York fashion weeks. Western chains like Urban Outfitters and Topman have picked up on this contemporary take on 1990s Russian wear, selling T-shirts with Cyrillic slogans. The post-Soviet look also includes graphic T-shirts, football scarves, cropped jeans and sportswear brands, worn together with higher-end items. Largely appropriated from the Russian working class, it also draws on the suburban "gopnik" subculture that appeared 25 years ago at the collapse of the USSR.

'Glorifying suburban hooligan'

For years after the Soviet Union's breakup, Russians were "students" of global fashion and their tastes imitated those of the West, said cultural commentator and entrepreneur Ilya Oskolkov-Tsentsiper. "But step by step, as the customer became more sophisticated, well-travelled, with more access to information, pictures, clothes and so on, we started to see the emergence of Russian street style," he told AFP.

With his sartorial "glorification of the suburban hooligan", Rubchinskiy has explored the previously ignored style possibilities of the "underprivileged", added Oskolkov-Tsentsiper, founder of the Strelka design institute who splits his time between Moscow and New York. He believes Western shoppers' enthusiasm for the post-Soviet trend could be tied to perceptions of Russia's increasing global reach, from Syria and the annexation of Crimea to accusations Moscow interfered in last year's US presidential election.

'Ai dont laik yu'

Sergei Pakhotin, the 32-year-old founder of clothes brand Sputnik 1985, agrees the political climate could be a factor in Russia's fashion resurgence in the West. "Before you had to study Chinese, now everyone wants to learn Russian," he said, halfjokingly, in Sputnik's store in a fashionable downtown Moscow

shopping street. Despite it being set back in a courtyard, making it invisible from Pokrovka Street, full of shops and bars, the clothes store attracts a number of foreign visitors who have heard about the brand online.

Sputnik's garments feature Soviet imagery with an $\,$

occasional punk twist. A T-shirt with an image of Swan Lake ballerinas and the numbers 1991 — in a reference to the ballet played continuously on television during the attempted coup that year-sells for 1500 rubles (\$25, 22 euros), while a badge with the phrase "Ai dont laik yu" spelled out in Cyrillic letters costs 300 rubles. Radiation symbols also feature in the designs of Pakhotin, who grew up in western Belarus, an area heavily affected

an area heavily affected by the 1986 Chernobyl nuclear disaster.

'Russian irony'

Whether foreign or Russian, few Sputnik customers will have had firsthand experience of the Soviet Union as most are in their mid-20s or younger. "There are people, who, even if they didn't necessarily grow up in Russia or the

Soviet Union, they understand the Russian type of irony, the Russian type of cynicism, the Russian type of humour," said Oskolkov-Tsentsiper. He points to the internationally sought-after stylist Lotta Volkova from Russia's Far Eastern Vladivostok as another example of someone who has expanded the look's global reach. At

the central Moscow bar and clothes shop Denis Simachev, an \$85 T-shirt adorned with the face of oligarch Roman Abramovich and the Russian-language slogan "My happiness depends on your success" hangs on the sales rack. Standing outside, Why Not events company co-founder Zhenya Popova says Muscovites are now more stylish than urbanites in Europe. "Everyone's moved on from wearing just one brand," says the 32-year-old, who is dressed in a green trouser suit from the homegrown Studio Nebo and a jacket from Italian label, No. 21. "Everyone's stopped thinking: if I wear Chanel now, that's really cool. They've started to dress in a more contemporary way, to mix things up, to combine something mass market with something more designer."

Tie-ups with Western labels

But Alexander Selivanov, the designer at the Russian street style store Codered, insists Western style still has a far greater influence on Russia than vice versa. Russian designers come to prominence abroad by allying themselves with foreign brands, he said, as was the case with Rubchinskiy's 2016 collaboration with Japan's Comme des Garcons.

"Because of (Rubchinskiy), the West is taking a lot of interest in what is going on here. "And while they're watching, you have to do something very quickly, make some contacts, get in on the story," he said. —AFP

Alruwayeh looks to train to become pro wrestler

uwaiti athlete Nasser Alruwayeh became the first competitor from the Gulf country to sign a contract with WWE, which was officially announced this past Friday during a live event in Abu Dhabi.
