Kuwait keen to clamp down on human trafficking

KUWAIT: Kuwait maintains a close rapport with international organizations involved in the fight against human trafficking, a Kuwaiti diplomat said yesterday. Kuwait's assistant foreign minister of development affairs Nasser Al-Sabeeh was addressing a seminar on the country's efforts to combat human trafficking, where he spoke of the foreign ministry's plan to bring the country's well-chronicled contributions to humanitarian

Riyadh to raise energy prices, compensate Saudi families

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia decided vesterday to hike energy prices while paying compensation to Saudi families, as the world's top oil exporter seeks new revenue sources. The cabinet, in a session chaired by King Salman, approved plans to "reform" electricity and fuel charges, as part of measures to counter lower oil prices on the world market, the official news agency SPA reported. In a first, the government also approved cash transfers to some 3.7 million Saudi families, covering 13 million of the country's 20-million population, to compensate them for the hike.

Expatriates working and living in the kingdom have been excluded from the cash transfer program which will start next week. The electricity authority has announced minor price increases from early next year. The energy ministry said new prices for petrol, diesel and aviation fuel will be applied in the first quarter of 2018, but without giving details on the planned increases. The hikes are the second wave of Saudi subsidy cuts.

The kingdom, which pumps around 10 million barrels per day of oil, has embarked on a series of reforms and price hikes since oil revenues plummeted in mid-2014. Saudi Arabia has posted huge deficits in the past three fiscal years, totaling over \$200 billion, and withdrawn another \$250 billion from its fiscal reserves. — AFP

Chess, therapy for ex-militants at Syria rehab

MAREA, Syria: In a rehabilitation center in northern Syria, young men huddle over an innocuous game of chess and some cigarettes - activities they once brutalv suppressed as Islamic State group militants. Based in the rebel-held town of Marea, the Syrian Centre for Countering Extremist Ideology is home to around 100 onetime IS fighters from Syria, the Middle East and even Europe. "I used to dream of establishing an Islamic state... but now, we take courses that clear up what's wrong with what we once believed," 23-year-old Mohammad Haj Ahmad says.

Ahmad hails from Raqqa, the northern city that served as the de facto capital of a now-collapsed militant "caliphate" sprawling across Syria and Iraq. He joined IS in 2014 and took part in one of its most gruesome battles at Tabqa airport near Raqa, where militants executed more than 200 army troops. "I was completely convinced by their slogans about jihad, that they were the only ones implementing religion correctly, and that everyone else was an infidel and an apostate," he tells AFP. "My father was scared I'd be convinced to blow myself up."

Now, Ahmad and fellow ex-militants are undergoing intensive rehabilitation courses in Marea aiming to wash away extremist habits so they can ultimately reintegrate into society. Ahmad doesn't know what he will

do once he is cleared by rebel authorities to leave the center. "Maybe I'll start a business, continue my studies, or go to Europe," he shrugs.

The two-storey center in Marea opened on October 27. "We founded the center because of the many fighters coming to northern parts of Aleppo province after the collapse of IS, which created a security problem," says its head, Hussein Nasser. Some lodgers checked in voluntarily, while others are undergoing therapy as part of the jail sentence dished out by rebel authorities for joining IS. They are split into three categories: Short-

term IS fighters, those who fought heavily or for an extended period and foreigners from Tunisians to

Treatment lasts up to six months, which can be renewed, Nasser says. The administrators, doctors, and activists who run the center coordinate closely with rebel authorities, particularly the court system. "The center's lecturers provide an assessment to relevant judicial authorities, who decide if the person can be integrated into society or not," Nasser adds.

Major challenges ahead for new Cabinet: Prime Minister

'Economic reform and remedying structural imbalances is inevitable'

KUWAIT: The key challenge for the new cabinet to overcome, as identified by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, is protecting Kuwait against perils of sectarian strife, and maintaining national unity, His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah told the cabinet's first session yesterday.

In a statement to the session which took place after the new ministers were sworn in in front of His Highness the Amir, His Highness Sheikh Jaber stressed the prime importance of preserving and enhancing national unity as the pillar, shield and fence safeguarding the domes-

This requires the utter rejection of any sectarian or tribal line-up since "We are all for Kuwait and Kuwait is for us all," Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Anas Khaled Al-Saleh said after the session. His Highness the Amir stressed these challenges in an address to the opening of the Second Term of the National Assembly's 15th Legislative Term. Maintaining Kuwait's security and stability has always to be the top concern of everyone, His Highness Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak said, referring to the perilous repercussions and implications of the changes and developments sweeping the region, and the world at large, prompting

top alertness and caution. No doubt, security is realized through achieving the rule of law, applying it to all, with no distinction, as well as upholding the power of the judiciary, and enforcing terrorism - achieving social security, and providing all services. bases of safety for people, now and in the future.

Economic reform

Inevitability of economic reform, and remedying structural imbalances resulting from relying on one nonrenewable source, namely oil, offer the second challenge

facing the new cabinet only worn in a day earlier, His Highness the Prime Minister said. Economic reform requires diversification of sources of income, enhancing non-petroleum revenues, pushing economic reform rates higher, improving the climate of investment and localizing distinguished foreign capital, besides bettering business environment to provide further job opportunities.

Improving planning for development, promoting government performance, supporting prerequisites of official administration through reducing duration of procedure, are further requirements. Others are modernizing management methods, reinforcing sound institutional work and cooperation with the control bodies to unravel shortages and imbalances, for a remedy and avoiding repetition. Moreover, economic reform needs discipline of the state's finances, bolstering rationalization and curbing losses, and in the meantime preserving the basis of dignified living and stability for the Kuwaiti people, both at present and in the future. Closely related to this is the necessity of protecting public funds by all means, and activating the fight against corruption to exterminate it, and to dry up its sources, besides crystalizing integrity, transparency and honesty through all official procedures.

A key commitment is achieving "Kuwait 2035" vision, with all its vital content and ambitious development plans, His Highness the Prime Minister said. This prompts harder work to complete development of the infrastructure, and public services; remedying educaprinciples of justice and equality. The concept of security includes - in addition to fighting and exterminating established constants- and promoting health and other established constants- and promoting health and other

> "I would like to point out the necessity of reviewing the agenda of the former government which I submitted to the National Assembly during this legislative chapter, to check if it copes with the views to face the outstanding challenges, and to meet the needs of the approved development plan," His Highness Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak said.

National commitment

The last challenge His Highness the Amir indicated was emending the path of parliamentary work as a national commitment, that can never be postponed, for "maintaining, and consolidating our national gains," His Highness the Prime Minister said.

Putting things right could be realized through serious commitment to the rulings of the Constitutional Court, the National Assembly's bylaw, the Court's explanatory notes on parliamentary work, commitment by each power to its domains with no concession of such authority whatsoever, in line with their responsibilities, as well as reaffirming independence, according to Article 50 of the Constitution. His Highness the Premier stressed that the government is always extending hand in cooperation with the National Assembly.

This is achieved through a work method that allows a

'constitutional' compromise formula for joint work mechanisms to realize the aspired fruitful cooperation achievements. Amid the widespread of misuse of social media by some people under the claim of freedom of expression, to incite sedition, enmity, and hatred, as well as stirring the public opinion in a way that threatens social security and the society's values and morals, His Highness the Amir has called for speeding up efforts to 'legally' curb this, His Highness Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak said.

This will be realized through appropriate mechanisms that preserve the values and constants of the society, protecting it against perils of sedition. Concluding the statement, His Highness the premier told the ministers that the Kuwaiti people are looking forward to their efforts and work to push a head progress and prosperity for the dear nation.

Sharing the burdens

At the onset of the statement to the first session of the newly formed cabinet, His Highness Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak highly appreciated His Highness the Amir's assignment to the cabinet, praying Allah Almighty to help them fulfill their duty as should be.

His Highness the Premier thanked the ministers for accepting to share him the "burdens of this stage our nation is going through, with its challenges and commitments that require hard efforts and sacrifices and joint work, inspired by 'Kuwait's interests, glory and

Message of love from French Ambassador to his friends before leaving Kuwait

Dear Kuwaiti friends, or rather, I should say "Dear Kuwait."

I address this message to Kuwait and my friends and to the meetings and gatherings I had with them, as well as the work we accomplished together in four years and three



months, which allowed me to discover an extraordinary country in the Arab world that I came to know quite well. I arrived from Paris on the 15th September 2013 and, literally, I did not know any person here at that time. My diplomatic life has allowed me to visit your country only once about ten years ago and it was for a short visit. I was a student in 1990 when, just like everybody else, I was shocked with the invasion of Kuwait and, seven months later, I was happy to know that Kuwait was liberated. In the courses I attended in preparation for the competition to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in France, Kuwait was often mentioned as an example in the administrative work we had to prepare and submit in the field of international relations and law enforcement. Directly after liberation, a friend of mine, a journalist who was living with me in Cairo at the time, visited Kuwait upon an invitation from Kuwaiti authorities to witness the looting and robbery that Saddam Hussein's forces had carried out. He returned with a live testimony that I kept all these years among my personal belongings without ever imagining that one day I would be with you during my term of office, which is about to end in a few days.

This message of friendship, or rather, this message of love, is my testimony on the years I spent with you: a message of love to those friends I met; young and old, women and men, students, artists, businessmen, politicians, ministers, members of the National Assembly and human rights defenders. During my stay in your country, I highly appreciated the spirit of debate that prevails, whether in offices, in press or through social networks. Democracy in your country is not an empty word, but a reality, and your diplomacy is a diplomacy of peace, just like diplomacy of France. Kuwait owes this to its leaders, in particular to His Highness the Amir, who is a true example of wisdom to the region as a whole and a "humanitarian leader" for the entire world.

The family spirit, which I treasure the most, prevails in Kuwait; everyone knows each other and exchanges visits in joyful occasions, such as weddings, and in times of grief at the death of any person. Kuwait is a large family in itself, with a very important trade heritage that is part of the country's fundamentals, in addition to its cultural dimension, with photographers, painters and musicians. I also learned the art of "selfies" and I did notice how distinguished the bloggers are on social networking sites and the activists in the fashion world. Your country is one of the most modern countries in the Arab and the entire world!

I am leaving behind in Kuwait several friends with whom I spent quality times chatting, exchanging conversations and dreaming about a better future for the region and peace in the world. Of course, as always, H.H. Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, from the very moment His Highness received me at

Bayan Palace, when I visited to deliver my credentials on the 4th November 2013, and while speaking in Arabic with me in a very nice and friendly manner, he just said to me gently and humorously: "Welcome in your second home!"

His Highness was extremely right! It took me mere few hours after my arrival on the evening of the 15th September 2013 to feel at home. I knew the Gulf States by then because I worked as the General Consul in Jeddah for many years. I also knew Lebanon, Syria and Palestine, as much as I knew Iran and its language, in addition to my knowledge of the Arabic language and the history of this region of the world. What I did not know is that all this, mixed in a high-speed mixer, would make me a friend to many Kuwaitis whom I found enjoying all the above characteristics; all except for the language. I had to get used to the local dialect and the use of feminine and masculine, which I mistook all the time. There was a friend who used to address me at the beginning of my stay saying "Shlonek" (How are you?), yet I always thought he was addressing the lady behind me, but then I found out that when he spoke to her he used "Shlonech" instead. Here I figured that I obviously have a lot of work on this subject or I shall look stupid in my conversations!

Now that we have become friends, I allow myself to reveal some secrets and perhaps give some advice, in a spirit of humor of course! Please, dear Kuwaitis: Travel less because it is almost impossible for me to know if I can see you at the end of the week except by following up your accounts on Instagram. Stop publishing Snapchat because whenever I am about to open this app the story disappears. Guys, spend less time at the gym and more time at the French Institute to get a certificate in French! Also, an advice from a friend about visas: do not submit your requests on Monday the 12th while you would like to travel on Sunday the 11th! You also shall have to find a solution to WhatsApp; this "national epidemic" with the "Selfie" pictures, which hit me as well, since I consult my messages by my right hand while dipping a "darabeel" into a glass of hot milk with saffron with my left hand; frankly, I cannot do them at the same time without ending up dipping my iPhone in the milk instead of the biscuits!

Kuwait has been a school for me; a school of working with excellent professionals at all levels, not to mention in foreign affairs and other ministries, as well as with the Amiri Diwan. Moreover, in the private sector, I learnt perseverance, patience and taking enough time to think, in addition to friendship in work relations and the desire to share with my country,

France, which loves you so much in return.

In the last few weeks, I have visited many "diwaneyas" and offices that I have visited during my stay to say goodbye to my friends. I met some of you personally to pay tribute. I also sent messages on WhatsApp and made some phone calls ... to bid farewell to you all and confirm that I shall see you again real soon. As our dear poet Sheikha Suad Al-Sabah says with great skill, "We Remain". I shall always enjoy seeing you again and I shall definitely accept all future invitation to 'majbus' dish on Tuesday or to share a dish of 'Naqror Fish', because, as per the old saying, "He who eats the eye of Naqror shall never leave". I shall come back!

History of archaeological excavations in Kuwait

KUWAIT: Throughout the years, foreign archaeological missions in Kuwait have contributed significantly to the discovery of several historic civilizations, some of which date back more than 7,000 years. The story of archaeological excavations in Kuwait dates back to 1957, before the independence of Kuwait, when the British administrator at the time invited the Danish exploration mission in Failaka Island, which is located 20 km from Kuwait City.

This was followed by the issuance of a law regulating archaeological work in 1960, the first in the Gulf region, and the later establishment of Kuwait National Council for

Culture Arts and Letters (NCAAL) in 2004. Since its conception, NCAAL has signed several cooperation agreements in the field with international academic bodies like the Slovak Academy of Sciences, the French Institute for the Near East, University of London, Durham University and University of Warsaw, amongst others.

NCAAL also has its own department of antiquities and museums, which is currently cooperating with a Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) counterpart on a project on the island of Failaka, where homes and a mosque dating back to the late Islamic period have been discovered.

The above-mentioned excavation missions are predominantly focused on two areas, namely the island of Failaka and the Al-Sabbiyah area, north of the Kuwait Bay. On Failaka, a whole city inhabited by the Dilmun civilization was unearthed by a joint team of French and Kuwaiti archaeologists. The civilization was around during the Bronze Age, around 2,000 BC.

The Dilmuns thrived between Mesopotamia (modern day Iraq) across the eastern regions of Saudi Arabia and Bahrain, up until the northernmost tip of the United Arab Emirates. The same team is also responsible, along with a team of Greek archaeologists, for the discovery of a Hellenic castle, also on Failaka, which dates back between 323 and 146 BC.

Two churches and a village, inhibited by Christians pre-Islam, were also discovered on the island along with kitchen utensils made from pottery. On the other hand, an Kuwaiti-Italian team are carrying out the excavation of an 800m area, where buildings dating back to the early and mid-Islamic periods have been found. —KUNA

Awqaf ministry to lay off 2,032 employees in massive budget cut

MPs meet to discuss jailed comrades' status

KUWAIT: In a bid to lower expenses, the Ministry of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs plans to lay off 2,032 employees working on assignment basis in various sectors, especially in the Quran affairs sector which currently employs 2,390 citizens and expatriates. The ministry's central assignment committee addressed the Assistant Undersecretary for Quran and Islamic Studies Dr Waleed Al-Shuaib and informed him that the second phase of reduction should include at least 15 percent of assignees and demanded a list of them by December 15, 2017. The committee explained that only ten out of 68 assignees working at Shuaib's office, 173 out of 1,153 in the Quran affairs department, 133 out of 888 in the Islamic studies department, eight out of 56 at the family development department and 34 out of 225 working at 'Al-Seraj Al-Muneer' department will be able to keep their jobs.

Expats replaced

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Education (MOE) is currently coordinating with the Civil Service Commission (CSC) to replace expatriate social workers with citizens,

Undersecretary Dr Hisham Al-Athari said yesterday. In other news, CSC yesterday approved proposed incentives for members of the judiciary and designated public prosecutors assigned by the Supreme Judicial Council to perform extra tasks. Designees in technical offices, those working in Kuwait institute for judicial studies, judicial inspec-

tion and judges will receive KD 500-600 monthly. In the meantime, designees in the public debts protection apparatus will receive KD 1,000-1,250 monthly.

Jailed MPs

Several lawmakers met yesterday at MP Mohammad Al-Mutair's office to discuss the

issue of the detainees over charges of breaking into the National Assembly building. Mutair is one of three lawmakers jailed in the case, along with Waleed Al-Tabtabae and Jamaan Al-Harbash. the case in courts. He added that another meeting will be held today at MP Tabtabae's diwan, noting that a message was sent to the speaker asking him and the parliament to act. Damkhi said that another meeting will be held next Monday at MP Harbash's office to discuss the issue regarding the new cabinet formation. Not enough

Environment Public Authority (EPA) Director Sheikh Abdullah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah said that the recently approved



authority budget was enough for all the duties and tasks stated in the environment law, but noted that the current budget of KD 25 million will not be enough in the future to perform all EPA duties, and therefore needs to be increased. On a different concern, Sheikh Abdullah stressed that the Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research (KISR) and the Public Authority for Agricultural Affairs and Fish Resources (PAAAFR) will have to cooperate on protecting fish reserves and national waters.

'Co-op' brandThe Union of Consumer Co-operative

Societies (UCCS) Secretary Ahmad Al-Mutairi said that a directive was distributed to various co-ops around Kuwait on providing 'Co-op' brand onions to help control onion prices in local markets. Mutairi added that the union has set the price of selling five kilos of Turkish onion to co-ops at KD 0.910, allowing them to sell the same to consumers at a KD 1 price. He added that co-ops wishing to purchase onions will have to request their purchases directly from the union and that they should respect the prices set for sale to consumers. Mutairi urged co-ops to shelf 'Co-op' brand products in outstanding places to encourage their sale.


Three faiths keep delicate balance in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM: Less than an hour after US President Donald Trump recognized Jerusalem as Israel's capital, Palestinians protested by turning off the lights on the Christmas tree outside Bethlehem's Church of the Nativity, the traditional birthplace of Jesus. It was a timely reminder that while headlines focused on Islamist calls for uprisings and Trump's references to Jewish historical ties, the president's words also stirred deep feelings among the Palestinians' small Christian community.

Coming out of the Sunday service in his Assyrian Catholic church in Jerusalem, Fredrick Hazo accused Trump of "dragging all the world into trouble", and called on the US leader to reverse his decision. "We are united - Christians, Muslims, we are one," said the 59-vear-old Palestinian musician, standing in an allev in the heart of the Old City, surrounded by shops selling religious trinkets. He was frustrated by the politics, but confident the delicate balance the three faiths kept in the holy city would prevail. "In this sacred place, God is protecting us all. We are guard-

ed by his angels in Jerusalem," Hazo added. Christians make up around just one percent of the Palestinian population in Gaza, the West Bank and Pope Francis called for the status quo in the city to be East Jerusalem - though they punch above their weight in local and national politics. Back in July, Hazo protested alongside Muslims against Israel's

installation of security scanners at the nearby Al-Aqsa mosque Islam's third holiest site - after two Arab-Israeli gunmen shot dead two Israeli police officers at the site. It removed the metal detectors after days of bloody clashes, scenes that have not been repeated in the city since Trump's dec-



The appeals to religious unity inside Jerusalem's walls stand in contrast to the more divided voices outside. In the hours running up to Trump's statement,

respected. The Episcopal Church of the United States said Trump's announcement "could have profound ramifications on the peace process and the future of a

two-state solution". But Trump's decision found strong backing from another corner of the Christian community many among his own country's politically powerful evangelicals who see God's hand in the modern-day return of Jews to a biblical homeland.

Trump convened a circle of evangelical advisers during his

presidential bid, and he was the overwhelming favorite of white evangelical voters in last year's US election. "We are all bible-believers and we believe that this is the bible-land and that Jerusalem is the

ancient capital of Israel back to the days of King David," said Dallas-based Mike Evans, part of an evangelical group that met Trump on Monday. "So for our president to stand up and declare it makes us extremely proud and honored." For Palestinian supermarket cashier Mohammed Al-Hawa, however, Trump's words and the logic behind them ignored the more complex reality on the ground.

People of all faith in Jerusalem were united in prayer, the 33-year-old said, even if they were divided over politics. "Christians, Jews and Muslims live in this city together. There is no problem between them. Only the politics. The governments want to make wars," he said. "This is my city - my blood, my life," added a 70-year-old Palestinian, walking through the pilgrim-packed courtvard of Jerusalem's Church of the Holy Sepulchre, revered by Christians as the site of Jesus's tomb. The church is packed into a small parcel of land that also holds the Al-Aqsa compound and Judaism's Western Wall "I can go to the church, to anywhere in Jerusalem, not Trump nor Netanyahu can stop me," added the man who identified himself only as a "Jerusalemite". — Reuters

New York bomber not on Bangladesh

terror list: Police

DHAKA: Bangladesh police scrambled yesterday for details about alleged New York subway bomber Akayed Ullah, but uncovered few early leads that might shed light on what might have driven him to try and kill commuters with a homemade bomb. US police say the 27-yearold immigrant from Bangladesh set off a crude bomb strapped to his body in a crowded New York subway passage on Monday but the device failed to detonate properly, leaving him the only one seriously harmed. Ullah told police investigators he wanted to avenge US airstrikes on the Islamic State group and was also inspired by Christmas terror plots in Europe, US media

Bangladesh police are investigating whether Ullah was radicalized in his Muslim-majority homeland, where foreigners have been among those targeted in deadly assaults claimed by the IS group and Al-Qaeda. "So far, his name is not on our wide-range list of radicalized persons or members of terror groups, both from Bangladesh and outside," senior counter terrorism police officer Sanwar Hossain said. "We are trying to gather more details," he said. US authorities say Ullah migrated seven years ago as the member of a family already living there under what is known as "chain immigration".

But a police spokeswoman in Bangladesh

said preliminary investigations suggested the family left "17 or 18 years ago". Bangladesh authorities are unclear exactly when Ullah left, but speculated he could have been shuttling back and forth between the two countries. "Maybe he was 10 or 11 years old (when the family left for the US)," police spokeswoman Sahely Ferdous said, adding Ullah's "development of thinking" likely took place there. Bangladesh police said Ullah's family hailed from Sandwip, an island off the coast of the southern port city of Chittagong but his father had left for the capital Dhaka some 30 years ago.

Visited Bangladesh in Sept

A friend of the family told AFP that Ullah married two years ago, but did not take his wife to the US. "His wife lives in Hazaribagh neighborhood in Dhaka, where the family lived for the last three decades, and where his father ran a grocery shop. They were married in 2015," Sazzad Hossain Mukul, a friend of Ullah's mother said. He said Ullah visited Bangladesh in September, and spent a month with his wife. Police confirmed the date of his last visit, but could not say whether Ullah was

Russia on alert for returning militants

MOSCOW: Russia's security service vesterday said it was on alert for the possible return of jihadists from Syria ahead of the World Cup and the presidential election in 2018. The FSB's warning came after the Russian military last week declared Syria "liberated" from the Islamic State group, and after a visit on Monday by President Vladimir Putin to Russia's airbase in the war-ravaged country.

Russia first intervened in the Syrian conflict in 2015, staging air strikes in support of President Bashar Al-Assad which targeted both IS and other jihadists as well as rebels fighting government troops. As many as 40,000 fighters travelled from all over the world, including Russia, to join IS in Russia after the 2014 declaration of its self-styled

In 2015, Russian security services estimated that 2,900 Russian citizens had joined IS, as well as "several thousands" from Central Asia. Now that IS' "caliphate" has all but collapsed, its "leaders and fighters are

"caliphate" straddling Syria and Iraq.

looking for ways to continue their terrorist activities in the territory of other countries, including Russia", FSB director Alexander Bortnikov was quoted by Russian agencies as saying. "The return of former members of illegal armed groups from the Middle East to Russia poses a real danger" as they can form sleeper cells and recruit new members, he

added.

Attacks thwarted Bortnikov said the security services had ensured the Confederations Cup ran smoothly this year. They will draw on this experience to ensure they prevent attacks on venues in 13 cities hosting the World Cup from June 14 to July 15 next year. "Our priority is to secure locations where crowds will gather, as well as energy infrastructure sites ... and sports venues that will host the 2018 football World Cup, to ensure they are not targets for terror attacks," Bortnikov said. — AFP

'Be careful,' murdered activist's daughter warns Europe exiles

Dutch police investigating shootings of Iranians

THE HAGUE: The daughter of an Iranian Arab activist killed in the Netherlands last month linked his death to political conflict in the Middle East, and warned other exiles in Europe to be on their guard. Ahmad Mola Nissi, 52, was gunned down by an unidentified assailant in front of his home in The Hague on Nov 8 in a suspected political killing. Hawra Ahmad Nissi said her father's death was reminiscent of a string of murders of Iranian dissidents in Europe in the 1990s.

"Europe seems safe, but be careful," she told Reuters in an interview. "The conflict between Saudi

Arabia and Iran is not confined to the Middle East. It is spreading into Europe." Relations between Shiite Muslim Iran and Sunni Muslim Saudi Arabia have soured in recent months, with the struggle for influence between the long-standing regional rivals played out through increasingly bitter proxy confrontations, notably in Syria,

Yemen and Lebanon. Mola Nissi established the Arab Struggle Movement for the Liberation of Ahwaz (ASM-LA), which seeks a separate state in Iran's oil-rich southwestern Khuzestan province, in 1999.

Since his murder, his family have been under Dutch police protection at a safe house. "We came here to be safe but we don't feel safe. European governments should do more to secure the safety of activists," Hawra Nissi,

25, said. Ahvazi Arabs are a minority in mainly ethnic Persian Iran, and some see themselves as victims of occupation and want independence or autonomy. Tehran, which has condemned Mola Nissi's killing and promised to investigate it, accuses Riyadh of funding separatist groups active in Iran, a charge the Saudis deny.

'Open to all scenarios'

A source close to Mola Nissi's family, who asked not to be named due to security concerns, said he had accepted Saudi financial support but did not want the

have made him a potential target. A man detained in relation to Mola Nissi's death has since been released, the spokeswoman added. The most prominent among a string of killings and disappearances of Iranian dis-

sidents in the 1980s and 1990s was the shooting of three Iranian Kurdish opposition leaders in Berlin in 1992, which a German court ruled had been ordered by the government in Tehran.—Reuters

Syria forces not yet victorious - but IS already defeated

BEIRUT: Syria is expected to soon follow in Iraq's footsteps in proclaiming victory against the Islamic State group, whose fighters are either on the run or trapped and largely toothless. On Saturday, the Baghdad government declared the end of a huge military effort that saw Iraqi forces painstakingly reclaim every little piece of the third of the country the jihadists controlled three years ago. The Syrian side of the "caliphate" IS proclaimed in 2014 has also disintegrated, with now only gaggles of fighters launching short-lived attacks or clinging to small pockets where they are completely besieged.

IS no longer controls a single town in Syria and while it may still count several thousand fighters among its ranks, observers expect Damascus to declare final victory before the end of the year. Syria's top ally Russia called it last week when senior military officer Sergei Rudskoi claimed "Syria has been completely liberated from fighters of this terrorist organization". On Sunday, French President Emmanuel Macron argued that was slightly premature and predicted that "military operations against Daesh (IS) in Syria will continue until mid- to late February".

Rami Abdel Rahman, who heads the Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, argued that IS was now largely rudderless and that surviving units were essentially fending for themselves. "There no longer is one central command giving orders. IS has been turned into groups scattered over Syria," said Abdel Rahman, whose monitoring group relies on a wide network of sources across the country. The group's fighters are most active in Syria's eastern Deir Ezzor province, where they are defending the last specks of land that used to be part of their "caliphate".

Several hundred fighters remain in that province alone, not enough to plan any realistic territorial reconquest but enough to cause damage in guerrillastyle attacks. According to Abdel Rahman, 23 progovernment forces were killed Monday in an attack



near Albu Kamal, the last major town IS controlled No.

fully before it eventually lost it in November. Dregs of the caliphate -

IS is still active in the following areas: The group still holds 18 villages on the eastern side of the Euphrates river in Deir Ezzor province, according to the Observatory. It controls a small area in the northeastern province of Hasakeh, which Kurdishled forces hope to reclaim swiftly. The jihadists also hold remote areas in the central Homs province, mostly two pockets which the regime is expected to take on soon

IS fighters are also in a small sliver of Hama province, further north, where they are battling jihadists from a rival group. IS also has a presence in the Palestinian refugee camp of Yarmuk, in Damascus, but IS fighters there have been besieged for years. The group also has fixed positions in two other areas of southern Damascus, Hajar al-Aswad and Tadamun. In the southern province of Daraa, fighters affiliated to IS also have a small presence.

No cohesion

"We will probably witness the end of IS as a land-holding force very soon but it will keep existing through sleeper cells," Abdel Rahman said. As the myriad of anti-jihadist forces clawed back land from IS over the past three years, thousands of routed jihadists are believed to have simply melted back into the desert or blended into civilian life. The "caliphate" was doomed almost from birth and IS has long begun morphing back into an insurgency that can still strike almost anywhere in Iraq and Syria with deadly suicide attacks.

"It has tried to maintain governance where it exercises formal and full control, but the norm now is functioning as an insurgent group," said Aymenn Jawad Al-Tamimi, an academic and expert on jihadists. The whereabouts and current level of involvement of IS supremo Abu Bakr Al-Baghdadi are unknown. The group no longer has a clear centre of power and its once unstoppable propaganda machine is sputtering out a now anaemic production. "I am sure there is still a chain of command but the overall structure is likely less cohesive than before," Tamimi said.—AFP

News in brief

Two Palestinians killed

GAZA: Two Palestinians were killed in the Gaza Strip yesterday with authorities in the Hamas-run territory blaming an Israeli strike, but Israel's military immediately denying the claim. The circumstances of the incident, which occurred near Gaza's northern border with Israel, were initially unclear. Palestinian health ministry spokesman Ashraf Al-Qudra said the two men were killed "in Beit Lahia in northern Gaza after an Israeli strike targeted a motorcycle". The Israeli army immediately denied this, saying in a statement "contrary to Palestinian reports earlier today, the (army) did not attack in the northern Gaza Strip". Qudra named the two men as Hussein Ghazi Nasrallah and Mustafa al-Sultan, both in their 20s. Family members at the hospital where the bodies were taken told AFP the two men were members of Islamic Jihad, an Islamist group that fought alongside Hamas in the last war with Israel in 2014.

Washington blasts Maduro

CARACAS: The US accused Venezuela's President Nicolas Maduro on Monday of a dictatorial bid to wipe his opponents off the political map following his latest poll victory, after he announced the main opposition is barred from next year's presidential election. Maduro's ruling socialists triumphed as expected in mayoral polls Sunday, taking 300 of the country's 335 mayorships after a boycott by the main opposition parties. But the president insisted that boycott would cost the opposition dearly: "A party that has not participated today and has called for the boycott of the elections cannot participate any more. That is a criterion of the National Constituent Assembly... and I support them." That removes from the electoral fray key figures such as Henrique Capriles, Leopoldo Lopez and others, and led the United States to say Maduro was seeking to consolidate his "dictatorship."

Fugitive wins seat

KATHMANDU: A fugitive wanted over a deadly attack on police won a seat in Nepal's national parliament yesterday, despite being in hiding and not once appearing in public during his campaign. Resham Chaudhary won the seat from Kailali in western Nepal by a landslide, securing more than double the votes of his closest rival, according to results from the election commission. Chaudhary has been in hiding since 2015 when he was accused of masterminding an attack in which eight police officers and a toddler were killed. "He is in our wanted list and we can arrest him even though he has been elected as a member of parliament, if we find him," said police spokesman Manoj Neupane. Chaudhary was a key figure in violent protests that erupted in 2015 over a contentious new constitution.

Australian MP quits

SYDNEY: A prominent Australian opposition senator, Sam Dastyari, said yesterday he would resign from parliament after a series of allegations emerged about his links with Chinese-aligned interests in Australia. Relations between Australia and China have become strained since Australia announced last week it would ban foreign political donations as part of a crackdown aimed at preventing external influence in domestic politics. In announcing the ban, Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull specifically singled out China, citing "disturbing reports about Chinese influence". China hit back, with the ruling Communist Party's official People's Daily describing media reports about its interference as "racist" and "paranoid". Dastyari, widely viewed as a rising star of the centre-left Labor opposition party, has been under fire since domestic media reported he had sought to encourage the party's deputy leader not to meet a Chinese pro-democracy activist opposed to Beijing's rule in Hong Kong in 2015.

EU summit set to unlock next phase of Brexit talks

BRUSSELS: European Union leaders are set to open the next phase of Brexit talks at a summit this week, but may toughen their conditions after Britain cast doubt on whether a deal on divorce terms is binding. British premier Theresa May and European Commission chief Jean-Claude Juncker reached a last-minute agreement Friday regarding the Irish border, Britain's divorce bill and the rights of EU migrants.

The leaders of the 27 remaining countries are to decide on Friday whether to approve that deal and green light the opening of talks on a post-Brexit transition period and the bloc's future relationship with Britain. But they have been alarmed by comments by Britain's Brexit Minister David Davis in which he said that Britain would not pay the bill without a trade agreement, and that Friday's deal was a "statement of intent" rather than "legally enforceable."

European Parliament Brexit coordinator Guy Verhofstadt said Davis's comments were "unacceptable" and a self-inflicted "own goal" for Britain as the EU would now take a tougher stance. "I have seen a hardening of the position of the council (of EU leaders) and hardening position of the parliament," Verhofstadt told reporters at the parliament in Strasbourg, France on Tuesday. The European Parliament is set to back in a vote today the opening of the second phase of Brexit talks. MEPs will also have a final say on any Brexit deal in 2019.

'Most difficult challenge'

With the possibility of a British backtrack in mind, the EU negotiating guidelines that leaders are set to adopt on Friday will say phase two talks can only start once the divorce commitments are "translated faithfully in legal terms." The EU leaders will also say that talks on trade will not start until March, to give the British government time to provide "further clarity" on what it wants from the future relationship.

Britain has said it will leave the EU's single market and customs union but has given no hint of a wider plan, with May's cabinet only having its first meeting on the subject next week-a full year and a half after the June 2016 Brexit referendum. The EU guidelines will add that talks on the transition-a period of around two years during which the bloc says Britain will have to follow EU law cannot start until January. The clock is ticking, as the EU says an outline deal needs to be in place by October 2018, so that the British and EU parliaments can approve it by

the time Britain leaves the bloc on March 29, 2019. EU President Donald Tusk warned last week after the divorce deal that "the most difficult challenge is still ahead".

Euro reforms

The EU leaders, again without Britain, will also on Friday discuss ways to reform the euro single currency, a top priority of French President Emmanuel Macron as well as Juncker. In a draft of the "leader's agenda" to prepare the summit, Tusk said there was

broad convergence among the heads of state on creating a crisis-fighting European Monetary Fund, as well as forging ahead with the banking union. But Macron's ambitions have been stymied by political uncertainty in Germany, where a weakened Chancellor Angela Merkel is still trying to form a government.

Germany is especially reticent to reforming EU public spending rules or setting up a European-wide deposit insurance scheme, the last remaining pillar of the banking union.—AFP

Rio's stray bullets give the innocent nowhere to hide

RIO DE JANEIRO: While the fighting in Rio de Janeiro's crime war is done by commando-style police and heavily armed drug traffickers, a growing number of the victims look quite different: innocent, joyful children like Maria Eduarda. Firefights erupt in densely packed, poor favela neighborhoods, leaving thousands of people with nowhere to hide each time the shooting, involving Kalashnikovs and other military grade rifles, begins.

AFP has investigated the stories of those caught in the middle, like 13-year-old schoolgirl Maria Eduarda, in a new multimedia report: "Stray Bullets: violence and

a new mathine report. The broken lives in Rio." With around 60,000 murders a year, Brazil is among the world's most dangerous countries. Rio, host of the 2016 Olympics, has long been one of the hotspots.

But as AFP's investigation highlights, stray bullet incidents add a cruel twist to the wider crisis. People are shot outside church, in parks or in restaurants, in daytime or at night. Since

the cheap construction of favela houses will not necessarily stop a bullet, even staying at home can be dangerous. Official figures for stray bullets are not released, but reports of incidents come in steadily. A count by Globo newspaper found that 632 people were shot by stray bullets in Rio state, at least 67 of them killed, in the first half of 2017 alone.


'So much blood'

For Maria Eduarda Alves da Conceicao, sudden death came at the northern Rio school where she was known as a diligent student and mad keen basketball player. In a tough city, she was doing everything right. On March 30, though, everything went wrong. Just outside her school gates, police with automatic rifles were firing on drug dealer suspects. It was the type of violent opera-

tion that would make top news in many cities around the world but is so common in Rio that it passes largely unnoticed. One burst of bullets tore past the school fence, hitting Maria Eduarda as she went to fetch water during gym class.

The police officers almost certainly didn't realize what had happened. They were busy wrapping up their operation outside: on a bystander's cellphone footage, they can be seen executing two apparently wounded suspects on the sidewalk in an almost casual manner. Inside, Maria Eduarda already lay dead. "I hugged and

hugged her," the girl's mother Rosilene Alves Ferreira said, recalling her arrival at the scene shortly after the tragedy. "She was still all warm. I hugged her and there was so much blood," said the 53-year-old mother, creases of worry etched across her forehead. "Two of the bullets had hit her little head."



Despite the lack of transparency on overall stray bullet casualties, an NGO called Rio de Paz (Rio of Peace) has kept a careful count of child victims since 2007. In just over a decade, the toll is 42 killed, including babies, toddlers and adolescents. Some died in the family car, some playing football, or while asleep. The rate is rocketing: 10 children died in 2016 and 10 so far this year, a steady increase on the seven slain in 2015, and a huge jump from the combined total of 10 in the five previous years.

Antonio Carlos Costa, founder of Rio de Paz, says the combination of dense populations, powerful rifles and ceaseless turf wars between different drug factions makes a lethal cocktail in the favelas. But he reserves his harshest criticism for the police, who treat the areas as war zones. "Police operations follow the logic of death, the logic of shooting first and finding out who it

was afterward," Costa said. "They've lost sight of the risks they impose on civilians." The police answer that ruthless drug traffickers, ruling entire neighborhoods at the point of a gun, are to blame. So far this year, 126 officers have been killed in Rio state this year, so they have reason to feel they are in a war.

Police are also hampered by funding problems and falling morale in the wake of the Olympics spending splurge. But while the debate about what needs changing goes on, the likes of Maria Eduarda are likely to keep getting maimed or killed. "I know they didn't target Maria, they didn't want to kill her, but they were reckless," her mother said.

Somali journalist killed

MOGADISHU: A Somali television journalist was killed by a car bomb in front of his children, relatives said, the fifth murder of a journalist in the war-torn country this year. Mohamed Ibrahim Gabow, a journalist working for Kalsan TV, had taken a break from work to spend time with his children. He had just left his home on Monday afternoon in the capital Mogadishu when a bomb planted beneath the driver's seat ripped through the car. He died in hospital. "He was a professional urnalist dedicated to working for the ing relative Mohamed Abdirahman said late Monday. "We don't know why they killed him in front of his children." No one has claimed responsibility for the attack, but journalists have been regularly targeted by rival forces in the long-running conflict. "The explosive device was attached beneath the driver's seat of the car," said police officer Ibrahim Mohamed.

Mugabe flies to Singapore

HARARE: Zimbabwe's former president Robert Mugabe has left the country for medical checks in Singapore, his first foreign travel since the army forced him from office last month, a state security official said vesterday. The 93-year-old, who ruled the southern African nation for 37 years, resigned after the army and his ruling ZANU-PF party turned against him when it became clear that his 52-year-old wife, Grace, was being groomed as his successor. Until recently the world's oldest head of state, Mugabe had a reputation for extensive and expensive international travel, including regular medical trips to Singapore - a source of public anger among his impoverished citizens. He left Harare with Grace and aides on Monday evening, the official said. He is expected to make a stop-over in Malaysia, where his daughter, Bona, is expecting a

170 killed in S Sudan

JUBA: The death toll from inter-clan fighting in South Sudan's Great Lakes region last week - a new source of violence in a country devastated by a four-year civil war - has reached at least 170, officials said yesterday. The clashes in the province's Malek county broke out after a group of young men from the Ruop ethnic group attacked rival youth from the Pakam group on Wednesday and Thursday. Revenge attacks have since taken place. Dharuai Mabor Teny, a member of parliament from the region, updated an earlier death toll of 45. "Right now, from both sides, we have 170 plus people who lost their lives. 342 houses have been burnt and almost 1,800 people displaced," Teny said. The violence prompted the government to declare a threemonth state of emergency in the region and surrounding areas on Monday. The military has also been ordered to deploy troops to quell the unrest.

Quake hits southeast Iran

BEIRUT: An earthquake of magnitude 6.2 hit Kerman province in southeast Iran yesterday, injuring 15 people and causing the walls of some houses to collapse, state media reported. The quake struck near the town of Hojdak, according to state TV. The US geological survey recorded its magnitude as 6.1 and said it struck at a depth of 57 km. Another quake, which Iranian state media reported at 6.0 and the USGS reported at 5.4, hit western Iran on Monday, in the same region where a magnitude 7.3 earthquake killed at least 530 people last month. There have been no reports of deaths or injuries from Monday's quake. Hardline rivals of President Hassan Rouhani have criticized the government's response to last month's quake as too slow and inadequate.

California wildfires

LOS ANGELES: It's been a week since southern California has been charred by a devastating wave of wildfires, blasted by almost hurricane force winds. Vast areas have been destroyed, hundreds of thousands of people have been evacuated and thousands of firefighters are working around the clock. The future of the infernos is at the mercy of the wind. The biggest concern is Thomas, which broke out last Monday and has already destroyed an area five times larger than the US capital Washington and threatens Pacific coast towns like Carpinteria, Summerland and Montecito. Here is a review of the present situation.

Number of fires

Six were registered during the week: in addition to Thomas, in Ventura County, there were three in Los Angeles (Creek, Rye, Skirball), Lilac in San Diego; and Liberty in Riverside. Other than Thomas, almost all are contained and the evacuation orders have already been lifted. But there have been long hours of panic. Los Angeles evacuated 150,000 people. Skirball - 85 percent controlled-affected the exclusive neighborhood of Bel-Air and millions of dollars of mansions were caught in the flames. The losses have not yet been calculated. Lilac, which engulfed a rural area with many stables, forced hundreds of horses had to be evacuated. Just over two dozen perished.

Extent of Thomas' damage

It still remains to be seen how much harm Thomas will do. The fire continues to grow and threatens nearby areas. In one week it wiped out 23,000 acres (93,000 hectares) and "severe weather conditions" could lead to "significant growth," according to the latest California firefighters bulletin (Cal Fire). More than 800 buildings have been destroyed, including 644 homes, while almost 6,400 officials work to try to contain the flames. Evacuation orders remain standing in areas of Ventura, Ojai, Carpinteria, Montecito and Santa Barbara.

Victims

Despite its hellish intensity, which has left behind scenes reminiscent of a moonscape in many areas, authorities so far

have reported one fatality-a 70-year-old woman who died in a car accident while fleeing from the flames in the Thomas area. Tens of thousands had to leave their homes, some ending up in shelters opened by the authorities and the Red Cross.

Weather forecast

The causes of the fires are under investigation. But whatever they are, it is the hurricane-strength winds and the low humidity that cause them to spread over huge areas of land at an amazingly alarming speed. Eric Boldt, a meteorologist at the National Weather Service (NWS), explained to AFP that even when the wind dies down, the drought conditions complicate everything. The fire is already the biggest disaster in California's history, but Boldt believes he has the potential to climb to the top spot.

Financial losses

There is no exact figure for the losses from this fire wave that has not even ended. The California Department of Insurance told AFP that the calculation is the product of the figures from insurance companies. As the fires are not over yet, there are people who do not even know if they lost their homes or businesses and did not activate their insurance.—AFP

'A little lost'

The SPD leadership itself has been brutally honest after four election defeats in a row, stating in a discussion paper that "many voters are unclear about what the SPD stands for". It was a sobering admission for the traditional working class party that long battled for the rights of workers, women and minorities, and whose members start their speeches with "dear comrades".

Now the SPD is struggling to reinvent itself in the age of vanishing factories, mines and dockyards and as robots and algorithms threaten to destroy ever more jobs. "That's the big question that hovers above everything," said youth wing leader Kevin Kuehnert, 28. "In future who will be the SPD's voter base?" At the congress, Kuehnert vowed to push on with the #NoGroKo campaign when delegates and members get to vote on a potential coalition deal. "The last GroKo was voted out when the two big parties between them lost 14 percentage points," he said. "That's certainly not a mandate for a new coalition."—AFP

Anger brewing in German SPD against Merkel power pact

BERLIN: To many German Social Democrats it sounds like a monster that will destroy their party if not democracy itself: the GroKo. The term is shorthand for "grand coalition", the mega-alliance of Chancellor Angela Merkel's conservatives and their own SPD labor party that has ruled Europe's top economy for the past four years.

"Never. Again. GroKo," read a pin-on button handed out by the party's youth wing at a fractious party congress in Berlin last week that was dominated by painful soul-searching over its worst election result in post-war history. The blunt message was illustrated with a picture of two hands forming a diamond shape, Merkel's standard gesture in front of cameras, which has come to symbolise the veteran chancellor dubbed "Mutti" (mummy). "We don't want a grand coalition," said one member, Michelle Rauschholb, 25, who fears the SDP will be forced to "betray its ideals" if it has another stint as Merkel's junior partner.

Going into talks with Merkel this Wednesday, SPD chief Martin Schulz is deeply sceptical about another GroKo power pact, and aware much of his party base is openly hostile to another coalition. But after months of post-election deadlock, Schulz has agreed to meet Merkel to sound out plans to give the unhappy partnership another lease of life, even though many Social Democrats fear it spells a mortal threat to their 150-year-old party.

'Political suicide'

The U-turn came after Schulz declared on the night of his September 24 election defeat that he would take the

NEW DELHI: Some 15.6 million abortions take place in India each year, with the majority of women taking pills at home without adequate counseling, a study said yesterday, calling for more trained doctors in public hospitals. The New Yorkbased Guttmacher Institute's research found that abortions are more than 22 times more common than the government's estimate of less than 700,000 terminations, produced by focusing on state-run hospitals and clinics. Just over 80 percent of abortions took place at home using drugs like mifepristone and misoprostol, 14 percent were performed surgically

in clinics and hospitals, and 5 percent were conducted using other, typically unsafe, methods.

"Women in India face considerable challenges trying to obtain abortion care, including the limited availability of abortion services in public health facilities," the Guttmacher Institute's investigator Susheela Singh, said in a statement. "Our findings suggest that a shortage of

trained staff and inadequate supplies and equipment are the primary reasons many public facilities don't provide abortion care," she said of the study, published in the Lancet Global

It is India's first national study of the incidence of abortion and unintended pregnancy, researchers said. Half of India's more than 48 million pregnancies were unintended, and a third resulted in abortions, the study said, using 2015 abortion pill sales and distribution data and surveys of six highly populated states. Researchers said that close to three in four abortions were achieved using drugs from chemists and informal vendors, rather than from health facilities where proper counseling and health checks should be provided.

In addition, the public sector - the main source of health care for rural and poor women - accounted for only a quarter of abortions, partly because many state-run hospitals and clinics do not offer abortion services. "Although abortion has been legal under a broad range of criteria in India since 1971, we have never had a reliable estimate of the number occurring until now," said Chander Shekhar from the Mumbai-based International Institute for Population Sciences, which collabo-


rated on the study. "This new evidence provides policymakers with information that is essential for designing and implementing effective reproductive health care programs," he added in a statement.

Condom advertisements

Meanwhile, India has slapped a nationwide ban on television ads for condoms during prime time hours, citing rules prohibit-

ing "vulgar" content and concerns over children viewing salacious material. The information and broadcasting ministry ordered India's estimated 900 television channels to restrict condom commercials to between 10pm and 6am, threatening repercussions if the ads fall outside graveyard hours. "All TV channels are hereby advised not to telecast the advertisements of condoms which are (a) for particular age group and could be indecent for viewing by children," the order said Monday. It also cited broadcasting regulations prohibiting

"indecent, vulgar, suggestive, repulsive or offensive themes". India's public and private television channels beam into



nearly 183 million households across the country, data from the Broadcast Audience Research Council industry group shows. Advocates for birth control warned the blackout risked undoing decades of progress on sexual and reproductive health. The Population Foundation of India, a Delhibased nonprofit, said condoms were one of the few meth-

ods available for family planning and encouraged men to also take responsibility for birth control. "What we need is a more sensitive approach without compromising on information and advocating for sexual and reproductive choice," the charity's executive director Poonam Muttreja said in a statement. —Agencies

A British murderer appeals conviction

HONG KONG: A British banker jailed for life for the horrifying murder of two Indonesian women at his upscale Hong Kong apartment in a cocaine-fuelled rampage appealed against his conviction yesterday. Cambridge University graduate Rurik Jutting tortured Sumarti Ningsih for three days-filming parts of her ordeal on his phonebefore slashing her throat with a serrated knife and stuffing her body into a suitcase.

Days later, and with Ningsih's corpse on his balcony, the former Bank of America worker picked up Seneng Mujiasih, intending to play out the same fantasies. He killed her when she started screaming. Jutting, now 32, had pleaded guilty to manslaughter on the grounds of diminthe judge at the time describing the killings as "sickening

However, Jutting's defense team yesterday argued that judge Michael Stuart-Moore had repeatedly given wrong directions to the jury during the trial last year when explaining how they should determine whether his state of mind had impaired his responsibility for his actions. Defense lawyer Gerard McCoy argued the judge had wrongly told the jury to look for mental "disorders' rather than the broader spectrum of "abnormality of the mind". "Abnormality of mind need not be a disorder," McCoy told the court Tuesday. "The judge has wrongly and prescriptively directed the jury that they should look for disorders because disorders are what is an abnormality of mind," he added.

Diminished responsibility

The defense team during the trial had argued that Jutting's mental responsibility had been substantially affected by heavy alcohol and cocaine use as well as sexual sadism and narcissistic personality disorders. Not all four medical experts who testified agreed that Jutting's behavior met the criteria for a "disorder" in all four areas,

said McCoy. However, they did all find that Jutting was suffering from an abnormality of mind because he had impaired mental functioning, he added. "The ground of appeal is the judge wrongly directed the jury as to the true meaning of abnormality of the mind," McCoy argued yesterday afternoon.

"All four experts agreed there were four concurrent abnormalities of the mind," he added. "That's what the jury should have been asked: did those four functionings constitute an abnormality of the mind?" Jutting was alert and taking notes in court Tuesday, dressed in a blue shirt and wearing dark-rimmed glasses, at one point smiling and talking with the guards in the dock. In the gruelling 10-day

trial last October and November, the jury heard how Jutting became obsessed with slavery, rape and torturefantasies he acted out on his first victim, Ningsih.

The jury was forced to watch iPhone footage of parts of the attack as well as Jutting's own self-recorded descriptions of how he had used pliers, sex toys and a belt during the killing. He then went on to murder his second victim, Mujiasih, slashing her throat in his living room. At the end of the trial. Stuart-Moore said Jutting had known what he was doing and described him as an "archetypal sexual predator" who presented an extreme danger to women. The hearing will continue today for prosecution arguments.—AFP

Nehru-Gandhi dynasty; the 5 things to know

NEW DELHI: Rahul Gandhi, the scion of India's Nehru-Gandhi political dynasty, was Monday named as the new leader of the main opposition Congress party, which has ruled the country for much of its independent history. Here are five key things to know about India's most famous political family:

Vehru became the country's first prime minister. The

assassinated by her Sikh bodyguards when she was prime minister, following a deadly confrontation between Indian security forces and Sikh separatist militants at the Golden Temple in Punjab state. She had groomed her younger son Sanjay to be her political heir, but he was killed in 1980 when the small plane he was piloting crashed. Her eldest son Rajiv reluctantly took over her political mantle, and served as prime minister from 1984 to 1989. He too was

Secrecy

The family has long cultivated an air of secrecy that some see as alien to modern politics. Even the details of Rahul's promotion to president were shrouded in mystery, with

Indian media taken by surprise at every turn. The party's outgoing president, Rajiv's Italian-born widow Sonia Gandhi, has said nothing publicly about her intention to stand down after 19 years. There has been speculation about her health since she travelled to the United States in 2011 for surgery. She was believed to be suffering from cancer, but this



has never been confirmed. Rahul's sister, the charismatic Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, is hardly seen in public except on the rare occasions she campaigns for the party. Rahul Gandhi rarely gives interviews to the media and only recently took to social media-a space his political rival Narendra Modi has conquered-in earnest.

Dominance

The Nehru-Gandhi family's decades-long dominance of Indian politics began to diminish in the late 1990s with the fortunes of the Congress party. Critics blamed the decline on a failure to identify with a new class of aspirational young voters. After Rajiv's death, the party was not led by a member of the Nehru-Gandhi family for several years, but in 1998, Sonia Gandhi agreed to take over. She propelled Congress back to power in 2004 and ruled behind the scenes for 10 years. But in 2014, the party was routed by the right-wing Bharatiya Janata Party following a string of corruption scandals.

Despite a series of electoral setbacks, few in the party have questioned the leadership of Sonia and Rahul. Many party veterans regard Sonia as untouchable after she agreed to take on the party presidency but turned down the chance of high office, choosing instead to rule from behind the scenes. But analysts see her hand in Rahul's elevation and warn that her reputation and that of the dynasty as a whole-now hangs on his performance as party leader.—AFP

Forced labor uncovered

NEW YORK: US authorities have accused two men in New York of recruiting immigrants from the Philippines to work for little or no pay at an historic catering hall in a case of human trafficking happening "in plain sight". The pair lured workers with promises of good jobs and paid money into their bank accounts but took it back and threatened to report them if they complained, the US Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency said in a statement. Many of the workers were living with expired visas in the basement of one of the accused men, ICE said. "This case is an example of ruthless labor trafficking hiding in plain sight," said Angel Melendez, ICE special agent in charge of Homeland Security Investigations in New York, in a statement. "These individuals allegedly committed visa fraud while forcing people to work in their catering hall under horrible conditions, in what seemed to be an inescapable situation.'

Sri Lankan rail strike

COLOMBO: Hundreds of thousands of pupils were left stranded yesterday after railway workers in Sri Lanka refused to abandon a strike during national exams. President Maithripala Sirisena had appealed to drivers, station masters and technical staff to end their industrial action to enable students to get to school. More than 400,000 students aged around 15 are sitting the examinations, which began yesterday, and the president's office said the transport difficulties would cause them severe stress. "Those who go on strike must realize the plight of the students sitting the exams today," one parent told the ITN television network. "Don't they have children of their own?" But a trade union spokesman said staff would not return to work until their demands for higher pay were met. And he condemned parliament for declaring railways an essential service, effectively making the strike illegal. "We did not want to cause inconvenience to the students, but we are continuing the strike because the government slapped the essential services order against us," Janaka

New 'supernote' found

SEOUL: A new high-quality counterfeit \$100 bill has been found in South Korea, bank officials said yesterday, prompting suggestions the sanctions-hit North might have resumed forging "supernotes". A team of forgery specialists at KEB Hana Bank have confirmed that a \$100 note found at a Seoul branch in November was a fake which was almost impossible to distinguish from real banknotes, they said. "It was the first of a new kind of supernote ever found in the world," Yi Ho-Joong, head of the KEB Hana Bank's anti-counterfeit centre said. Previous "supernotes" were dated either 2001 or 2003 but the new forgery is dated 2006. The same methods including raised and dented printing and no-smudge inks that are normally used for real banknotes have been applied to the newly found supernote, he said. "You need facilities worth some \$100 million to produce counterfeit bills of this quality and no crime rings would invest that much to make fake dollars," he said.

French oppn veers right

PARIS: France's new opposition leader Laurent Wauquiez scrambled yesterday to hold his Republicans party together, two days after it picked the controversial rightwinger to take on centrist President Emmanuel Macron. Wauquiez was elected head of the centre-right Republicans on Sunday, running on a hard-right platform that has seen him accused of cosying up to far-right National Front (FN) voters. Twenty-four hours later, Xavier Bertrand, a party heavyweight from the northern Pas-de-Calais region, quit the Republicans-the first of a handful of politicians to walk out. "I no longer recognize my political family, so I've decided to quit," Bertrand, a moderate who served as the party's secretary-general from 2007 to 2010, said Monday evening, accusing Wauquiez of "aggressiveness". On Tuesday, the mayor of the northern town of Roubaix. Guillaume Delbar, followed suit, as did two other Bertrand loyalists in the north.

In Jakarta, flood-hit slum residents aim for a drier future

JAKARTA: Whenever floods hit her one-room shack in northern Jakarta, Irma Susanti hangs her most precious furniture - a bed and a table - from the ceiling with a rope. "You can never be too prepared," says the resident of Muara Angke, a coastal area in Jakarta. In July alone heavy rains flooded her home up to knee level, she said.

"But that wasn't the worst - once, the water was up to our necks and destroyed all the food, clothes, everything," she told the Thomson Reuters Foundation, mimicking the action of waves with her arm. Jakarta, a coastal city built on a swampy plain, faces no end of flood worries, not least because roughly 40 percent of its land sits below sea level. Increases in sea level and regular floods from heavy rain and monsoons, combined with crumbling infrastructure to cope with excess water, mean the city's slumdwellers often face the brunt of water problems, experts say.

But an effort by the city to rehouse some of the city's threatened poor in low-cost but flood-resilient buildings is winning converts, not least among flood-battered slumdwellers. "Residents in informal settlements along the riverbank, like (in) Muara Angke, are most at risk of flooding," said Nyoman Prayoga, flood resilience program manager at charity Mercy Corps Indonesia. "Not only are they exposed to sea-level rise, they also have to deal with the drainage system being clogged up with trash, which makes the flooding worse," he added.

The Indonesian government is trying to address the growing problem by demolishing homes in flood-prone areas like Muara Angke to make way for new, affordable housing, said Muhammed Andri, head of the Penjaringan district in northern Jakarta. "Four years ago, 90 percent of the district was flooded, and people's homes and belongings destroyed," the official said. "Since then we've relocated 1,200 families to new low-cost buildings in the area." —Reuters

Longevity

The Nehru-Gandhi family has dominated Indian politics since independence from Britain in 1947, when Jawaharlal dynasty has produced three prime ministers and a member of the family has been in charge of the country for nearly 50 of the 70 years since independence. The Gandhi surname derives from Feroze Gandhi, who married Nehru's daughter Indira in 1942. He was unrelated to Mahatma Gandhi, but sharing his name is unlikely to have harmed the family's political fortunes.

In 1984, Nehru's only daughter Indira Gandhi was assassinated in 1991.

US cautious on electric buses despite forecasts

Communities across the United States are looking to replace their dirty diesel buses, ushering in what some analysts predict will be a boom in electric fleets. But transit agencies doing the buying are moving cautiously, an analysis by Reuters shows. Out of more than 65,000 public buses plying US roads today, just 300 are electric. Among the challenges: EVs are expensive, have limited range and are unproven on a mass scale.

A typical 40-foot electric bus costs around \$750,000, compared with about \$435,000 for a diesel bus. Cheaper fuel and maintenance expenses can lower the overall costs over the 12-year life of the vehicles. But those costs can widely depending on utility rates, terrain and weather.

The technology is still a gamble for many cities at a time when bus ridership is falling nationwide and officials are trying to keep a lid on fares, says Chris Stoddart, an executive at Canadian bus maker New Flyer Industries Inc. A top supplier of conventional buses to the US market, the company has just a handful of pure battery electrics in service. "People worry about being an early adopter. Remember 20 years ago someone paid \$20,000 for a plasma TV and then 10 years later it was \$900 at Best Buy," said Stoddart, senior vice president of engineering and customer service for New Flyer. "People just don't want a sci-

Rival electric bus manufacturers expect dramatic growth; the most ambitious forecasts call for all bus purchases to be electric by 2030. But even green-energy advocates are skeptical of such rosy predictions. CALSTART, a California-based nonprofit that promotes clean transportation, figures 50 percent to 60 percent of new buses will be zero emissions by 2030. Market research firm Navigant Research expects electric buses to make up 27 percent of new US bus sales by 2027.

Not Quite There Yet

Transit agencies have found EV performance lags in extreme conditions. In environmentally friendly San Francisco, officials have resisted electrics over concerns about the city's famously steep hills. "The technology isn't quite there yet," Erica Kato, a spokeswoman for the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, said in a statement. Weather is also a major challenge. An electric bus tested last year near Phoenix wilted in the summer heat due to the strains of running the air conditioning. The vehicle never achieved more than 89.9 miles on a charge, less than two-thirds of its advertised range, according to a report by the Valley Metro Regional Public Transportation Authority.


In Massachusetts, two agencies running small numbers of electric buses - the Pioneer Valley Transit Authority in Springfield and Worcester's Regional Transit Authority - say the vehicles weaken in extreme cold and snow. They have no plans to acquire additional EVs, officials at those agencies said. Even places with successful pilots have downplayed expectations. Seattle's King County Metro transit agency soon will be operating more than a dozen vehicles by three manufacturers, according to Pete Melin, director of zero emission fleet technologies. The agency likes what it has seen so far.

Still, Melin said, high electricity rates from the local utility at peak demand periods are a concern. And the lack of a uniform charging system among bus makers has complicated Seattle's goal of running an all-electric fleet by 2034. "We have caveats to becoming zero emissions," Melin said in an interview. Another worry is government funding. Federal money for bus purchases is about 25 percent lower than it was five years ago, according to Rob Healy, vice president of government affairs for the American Public Transportation Association. An Obama-era program that sets aside \$55 million a year in grants to help transit agencies purchase clean buses will expire in 2020 if not renewed

The EV Bus Heavyweights

In addition to New Flyer, the fledgling US electric bus industry has two other major players: Chinese automaker BYD, which is backed by Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway Inc; and Silicon Valley startup Proterra Inc. BYD and Proterra began selling electric buses into the US market several years ago, and have 165 and 126 vehicles on the road today, respectively. Both are ramping up US manufacturing on expectations that EVs will account for nearly all new bus sales in a little over a decade. BYD has a plant in Lancaster, California, while Proterra has manufacturing facilities in City of Industry, California and Greenville, South

Buffett paid \$230 million for a 10 percent stake in BYD in 2008. Today the company has a market capitalization of \$25 billion, thanks mainly to China's aggressive move to electrify transportation. More than 15 percent of the 608,600 buses in China are pure electric, according to government data. Proterra investors include venture capital firm Kleiner Perkins Caufield & Byers and the venture capital arm of General Motors Co. Proterra, based in Burlingame, California, is planning an initial public offering, but would not give a timeline for the debut.—Reuters



Erdogan risks diplomatic spat with Israel

Cartoon for the Soul

By repeatedly hitting out at the US move to recognize Jerusalem as Israel's capital, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan may be catering to his voter base, but he risks sabotaging Turkey's already fragile relations with the Jewish state. While US President Donald Trump's decision last week was met with near-universal condemnation, particularly from the Muslim world, Erdogan has emerged as its most outspoken critic.


Following Trump's decision to recognize Jerusalem as Israel's capital and to move the embassy there, Erdogan has levelled a string of accusations against Israel and the US, in his usual strident style. Among other things he said Israel was a "terrorist state" that kills Palestinian children, adding that the US had "become a partner to this bloodshed". Such sentiments echo those held by many among Erdogan's traditional voter base of Sunni Muslims in Turkey. His statements have also galvanized his popularity among some Muslims in the Arab world.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu responded to Erdogan, saying he was "not used to receiving lectures about morality from a leader who bombs Kurdish villagers in his native Turkey, who jails journalists, who helps Iran go around international sanctions, and who helps terrorists, including in Gaza". Erdogan, who considers himself a fervent supporter of the Palestinians, will hold a summit of leaders of Muslim countries today, which he claimed will mark a "turning point" in the response to Washington's decision. Traditional heavyweights of the Middle East like Saudi Arabia and Egypt have condemned the move, but without announcing any concrete measures of their own.

'Serious risk'

Erdogan, who comes from a conservative Islamist background, frequently criticizes Israel and does not conceal his support for the Palestinian Islamist movement Hamas, listed as a terrorist organization by the US, Israel and several countries around the world. His statements have been "consistent with the prevailing feelings among his own followers inside Turkey", said Marc Pierini, visiting scholar at Carnegie Europe and former EU ambassador to Turkey.

But Erdogan's escalation comes as Turkey and Israel are working to normalize ties since last year after a near-break in relations triggered by Israel's storming of



a Gaza-bound ship in 2010 which left 10 Turkish activists dead. "Given the Israeli reaction to these statements, there is indeed a serious risk for Turkey-Israel normalization. I think this is a risk that both sides are ready to take," Pierini said.

According to Aaron Stein, resident senior fellow at the Atlantic Council's Rafiq Hariri Centre, Erdogan is

already thinking about elections scheduled for Nov 2019 when he is expected to run for a new term as president with boosted powers under an executive presidency approved in an April referendum. By taking a firm stand against the Jerusalem move, it is "part of his broader effort to paint himself as the protector of oppressed Muslims around the world," Stein added. "The two sides don't like each other, but are not standing in the way of normal economic relations. I think this is likely to continue, given Erdogan's political calculations and Netanyahu's own legal and political problems," he added.

'Domestic considerations prevail'

Sinan Ulgen, chairman of the Istanbul-based Centre for Economics and Foreign Policy and visiting scholar at Carnegie Europe, believes that Erdogan's rhetoric on Jerusalem more broadly reflects a shift in Turkey's foreign policy approach since the arrival of the Islamicrooted Justice and Development Party (AKP) in 2002. "Traditionally, Turkey was able, in its diplomatic practice, to operate more in isolation from domestic political considerations," Ulgen said. "This has changed under AKP rule so that Turkey finds itself at almost another extreme where most foreign policy decisions are driven by domestic calculations." Ulgen said that it was from this perspective that Turkey's efforts to lead the campaign against the US move should be read. Erdogan 'believes that there is public support at home to justify this more aggressive rhetoric against Israel", even if it risks provoking a new diplomatic crisis, Ulgen said. "One more time, domestic considerations tend to prevail over more cautious diplomatic practice." — AFP

Zimbabwe widows left in the cold

When Sheila Chimoyo's husband died in 2011, it didn't take long before accusations started to fly. Her in-laws claimed she had used witchcraft to kill her husband, and seized the small house where she lived with her two children in the Zimbabwean capital Harare. "I was accused of bewitching my husband. I am not a witch and I did not kill my husband. It was a terrible experience because everything happened when I was still mourning," she said. "I hope and pray other women will not go through what I went through," she told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

But Chimoyo is not alone. Many widows in Zimbabwe lose property to in-laws, even on the day their husband dies. Many Zimbabwean widows face insurmountable obstacles defending their property or taking legal steps to reclaim it, according to a report by Human Rights Watch published last January.

Fending off relatives while mourning their husbands and selling assets like cattle to pay court fees to fight eviction were among the challenges widows face, the report said.

"This is a problem I am familiar with since I am a widow that suffered the same fate," Zimbabwe legislator Priscilla Misihairabwi-Mushonga told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. She was widowed after her husband died from injuries sustained in a botched armed robbery at her home. Even though she is an influential politician and a former government minister, in 2010 she signed over her late husband's estate to his relatives after they hounded her for months - both on her doorstep and in the courts.

Customary Law

The country's 2012 national census counted more than half a million widows in the country, most of them over 60 years old. And at least 70 percent of women in rural areas are in unregistered traditional marriages and are living under customary law, say rights groups, which offers no protection when it comes to property. "Many widows lose property on the day their husbands die, whilst they are mourning," Misihairabwi-Mushonga said. "Relatives begin to take livestock from the widow and on extreme cases will insist that if she refuses (to marry another member of the family) she can't continue to stay in the family homestead."

In cities, this also includes cars, furniture and banishing the widow from the matrimonial home. "Once in court, widows without an official record of their marriage, if it was a customary union, face a lot of challenges. Courts look to the in-laws the very people who stand to gain - to confirm the marriage, putting widows at the mercy of their husband's family," said the Human Rights Watch report.

In 2013, Zimbabwe adopted a new constitution which has provisions for equal rights for women, including for inheritance and property. But, in practice, the report said, existing laws only apply to widows in officially registered marriages. The ousting last month of former President Robert Mugabe brought to power his former vice president, Emmerson Mnangagwa. It was not clear what steps Zimbabwe's post-Mugabe government would take to protect the land rights of widows. The new Minister of Justice, Ziyambi Ziyambi, said the government would look into the issue. "I am only a day in office but we will look into the problems and see how best we can address them," Ziyambi told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.—Reuters

US gun control advocates switch strategy

Five years after a gunman killed 20 children and six adults at a Connecticut elementary school, advocates who are disappointed with the failure of efforts to limit access to firearms are changing their strategy. Instead of pressuring lawmakers to push new guncontrol measures through the US Congress, volunteers from groups including Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America are now running for office themselves.

Nine of 13 volunteers trained by the group ran for office this year and won seats, ranging from New Hampshire state representative to city council member in West University Place, Texas. Fourteen more have already declared their intentions to run for office in 2018, seeking seats in Congress, state legislatures and local government, all running as Democrats. "The reality is that the work doesn't really start in Congress. That's where it ends," said Moms Demand Action founder Shannon Watts, who launched her group the day after the Dec. 14, 2012, massacre at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Newtown,

The group began training candidates after more than 400 of its 70,000 members said they were interested in running for office. "This is a marathon, not a sprint," Watts said "It's going to take several election cycles." Even if the next class of candidates, none of whom are running as Republicans, succeed in winning office, they will face an uphill battle against a US Congress controlled by Republicans, who are staunch defenders of the right to bear arms protected by the Second Amendment of the US Constitution.

Sandy Hook was at the time the seconddeadliest mass shooting carried out by a single gunman in US history. It sparked new energy among gun-control advocates who pushed for fresh federal restrictions on assault weapons, which were blocked by Republican lawmakers and the powerful National Rifle Association lobby. A steady stream of mass shootings have continued across the United States since Sandy Hook, including two deadlier incidents - the slaughter of 58 people at a Las Vegas concert in October and the massacre of 49 people at an Orlando gay nightclub last year.

Grassroots Effort

Mark Barden, whose son Daniel was among the 20 first graders killed in Newtown, said he believes grass roots achievements like the new crop of gun-control candidates will lead to more action. "This is a social change and it takes time," Barden said. "What's happening in Congress notwithstanding, the change is going to come from the ground up."

In the meantime, Barden is working with Sandy Hook Promise, a volunteer effort to prevent more shooting deaths. The group said that in the past two years it has trained 2.5 million students and families to recognize signs of potential gun violence and report them to authorities. Social change, whether it is about drunk driving or recycling, comes from the ground up, said Nicole Hockley, whose 6-year-old son Dylan died in the Sandy Hook attack. "In the gun violence prevention movement, we have not focused on getting behavioral change. It's all been focused on top-down and that is not how you get change," she said.

Next year's class of gun-control candidates includes a mother whose son was shot dead and a bystander paralyzed from the middle of her chest down in a drive-by shooting. Lara Kennedy is running for US House of Representatives in the Texas district that encompasses Austin and north of San Antonio. Lucy McBath, whose only child Jordan Davis was shot dead after an argument over music while parked in Florida in 2012, is running for the Georgia House of Representatives.—Reuters

Macron warns world losing battle against climate change

PARIS: French President Emmanuel Macron delivered a bleak assessment on the global fight against climate change to dozens of world leaders and company executives yesterday, telling them: "We are losing the battle". "We're not moving quickly enough. We all need to act," Macron said, seeking to breathe new life into a collective effort that was weakened this summer when President Donald Trump said he was pulling the United States out of an international accord brokered in the French capital two years ago.

Modern-day science was revealing with each day the danger that global warming posed to the planet, he said. "We are losing the battle," he said, urging the assembled heads of states, ministers and executives to launch a new phase in the fight against global warming. No internationally binding commitments were to be made at yesterday's "One Planet" summit.

In focus is how public and private financial institutions can mobilize more money and how investors can pressure corporate giants to shift towards more ecologically friendly strategies. More than 200 institutional investors with \$26 trillion in assets under management said yesterday they would step up pressure on the world's biggest corporate greenhouse gas emitters to combat climate change. That, they said, would be more effective than threatening to pull the plug on their investments in companies, which include Coal India, Gazprom, Exxon Mobil and China Petroleum &

Chemical Corp. Separately, European Commission Vice President Valdis Dombrovskis said the executive was "looking positively" at plans to reduce capital requirements for environmentally-friendly investments by banks in a bid to boost the green economy. The move could be part of a broader set of measures the EU plans to present in March to meet the target of cutting carbon emissions by 40 percent by 2030, for which it estimates around Ä180 billion (\$212.2 billion) in additional low-carbon investments are needed per year.

Climate change is causing more frequent and severe flooding, droughts, storms and heatwaves as average global temperatures rise to new records, sea ice melts in the Arctic and sea levels rise. Developing nations say the rich are lagging with a commitment dating back to 2009 to provide \$100 billion a year by 2020 - from public and private sources alike - to help them switch from fossil fuels to greener energy sources and adapt to the effects of climate change. "The missing piece of the jigsaw is the funding to help the world's poorer countries access clean energy so they don't follow the fossil fuel-powered path of the rich world," said Mohamed Adow, charity Christian Aid's lead on climate change.

Yesterday, the European Commission unveiled 9 billion euros worth of investments targeting sustainable cities, sustainable energy and sustainable agriculture for Africa and EU neighborhood countries. Some 50 world leaders and ministers are in Paris, including Mexican President Enrique Pena Nieto and leaders of states at the sharp end of climate change such as Chad, Bolivia and Haiti. He says the center is financed locally but seeking additional funds to take in more foreigners and open a branch for female IS members.

Inside, patients shuffle into classrooms for group and individual therapy sessions as well as courses on Islamic law, civil rights, and psychology. Some sport beards and others are clean-shaven. Most wear an unofficial uniform of bright sweatshirts under sleeveless back vests. "The courses are similar to corrective treatment, giving them positive outlooks on themselves and their abilities," says the centre's psychosocial therapist Abdulkarim Darwish.

Darwish listens to their life stories, then runs therapy sessions to identify what social factors led them to join IS. During breaks, the ex-militants pray, eat modest meals on mattresses lined around a windowless room, and play chess - one of the many forms of entertainment IS considered un-Islamic - or spend time with

their wives and children, who also stay at the center.

"I never thought I would turn into a militant," says Hawas Al-Ali, 26, who quit his job as a cook in northern Iraq in 2016 and moved to east Syria. He joined an IS police unit deployed to bolster flailing militant fighting battalions. "My aim was the victory of Islam, but after a while I began thinking about returning to civilian life, society, my relatives and children," says Ali. He checked himself into the center and now says he's excited to return "to my life before Daesh (IS)". Ali fears being arrested if he returns to Iraq, so for now is stuck in northern Syria and may travel to Turkey.

Ashraf Nasir, 24, says he is ready to become again an active member of a society which IS once terrorized. "I'm an essential part of society - I didn't come from under a rock or from Mars, even though I joined Daesh," he says. The problem, Nasir worries, lies in "how society will accept us". Going home will be even harder for foreigners like Muslim Gadzhimetov. The Ukrainian entered Syria in 2016 coming from Turkey to join IS and earlier this year he was detained by rebels. Gadzhimetov says he decided to defect when he learned of the atrocities committed by IS against other Muslims. "I consider myself guilty for this," he says. "Of course I want to socialize and so on, I want to return to civilian life. I dream about this life." — AFP

Saints were Premiership champions in 2014 but are currently languishing in 10th spot and are on the brink of elimination from the European Champions Cup after Saturday's defeat by the Ospreys. —AFP

ROC approves athletes competing under neutral flag

MOSCOW: The Russian Olympic Committee (ROC) vesterday gave a green light for its athletes pete under a neutral flag at the 2018 Winter Olympics despite a ban on the country's national team.

We all had the same opinion: our athletes need to go to South Korea and try to bring back a victory for Russia. Russian athletes have expressed their will to take part in the games," the ROC president Alexander Zhukov, who is suspended from the IOC, told a press-

The ROC "will respect the will of every athlete. The ROC will take all necessary measures for financial, legal and sport-related assistance for those who will take part in the games and those who will be refused or will not receive an invitation", Zhukov added

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) last week decided to ban Russia from the 2018 Games, from February 9-25, over accusations of a state-spon-

sored doping programme at the 2014 Sochi Games. It said it would only allow "clean" Russian athletes to participate under strict conditions and under the Olympic flag. Zhukov said the Russian Olympic Committee will send a delegation to Lausanne,—AFP

Russia's Olympic Committee to support neutral athletes at Winter Games

MOSCOW: Russia's Olympic Committee agreed yesterday to support its athletes who choose to compete in next year's Winter Games in South Korea as neutrals following a ban on the Russian national team.

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) last week banned Russia from the Games, due to take place in Pyeongchang in February, for what it called "unprecedented systematic manipulation" of the anti-

But it left the door open for Russian athletes with a clean history of non-doping to be invited to compete as neutrals under an Olympic flag, not a Russian one.

President Vladimir Putin said last week Russia would not prevent its athletes from competing, dismissing calls by some for a boycott, and an ROC official said on Monday most Russian athletes still wanted to attend.

The Russian committee(ROC) agreed its position at a meeting on Tuesday attended by sporting figures including the national men's hockey team, figure skaters, speed skaters and the presidents of winter

sports federations. ROC President Alexander Zhukov said: "All the participants were of the same opinion our sportsmen need to go to Korea, need to compete, achieve victory for the glory of Russia, for the glory of our motherland." Zhukov said Russia would do its best to support Russian athletes competing under a neutral flag and hold serious talks with the IOC in the near future to discuss the problems and practicalities of the arrangement. He did not say what form this support

"Russian sportsmen have stated their readiness to take part in the Olympic Games, despite the difficult conditions and decision of the IOC, which is undoubtedly unfair in many ways," he said. Zhukov added that Russia would also support the athletes who had decided not to compete in Pyeongchang.

Senior Russian Olympic official Vitaly Smirnov, who heads Russia's state-backed anti-doping commission, said the country had made the "right decision" not to boycott. "A boycott is not a solution," Smirnov said. "That (would mean) new sanctions and problems for our athletes." In the weeks leading up to the IOC ban, more than 20 Russian athletes who competed at the 2014 Sochi Games were banned for life from the Olympics for allegedly breaching anti-doping rules.

Russian authorities have vehemently denied any state support for doping and have pledged to co-operate with international sports bodies to counter the use of banned performance-enhancing drugs.

Russia's athletics federation, paralympic committee and anti-doping agency RUSADA remain suspended over doping scandals.

"OLYMPIC ATHLETE FROM RUSSIA"

Sitting in the front row of the Russian Olympic Committee auditorium ahead of the meeting, hockey star Ilya Kovalchuk said he would not mind competing at the Games as an "Olympic Athlete from Russia," the term the IOC uses to designate the Russians who will go to Pyeongchang.

"We are athletes from Russia, after all," Kovalchuk told reporters. "They took the flag away but they can't take away our honour and our conscience."

Kovalchuk, one of the first to call for athletes to compete in Pyeongchang after the IOC ban, thanked authorities for taking the opinions of athletes into consideration. "Thank you for having heard us, for having believed us," Kovalchuk said. "I think that every athlete who takes part in the Olympic Games in Pyeonchang will do everything possible.'

Olympic fencer Sofya Velikaya, chair of the ROC's athletes commission, called on the Russian public to respect athletes' decisions to go to Pyeongchang amid concerns that some could be branded traitors for agreeing to compete without the country's flag. "The athletes will show their love for their motherland and their patriotism through their results, through their accomplishments and medals," Velikaya said. —AFP

Marsh raring to go if called in Perth Test

SYDNEY: Australia all-rounder Mitchell Marsh said he was ready to go if his improved batting in domestic cricket earned him the nod for the third Ashes test against England that starts in Perth tomorrow.

The 26-year-old underwent shoulder surgery earlier this year and faced nine months on the sidelines but returned for Western Australia in October and scored 680 runs in all forms of cricket at an average of 68.

He has scored two centuries, a 95 and 80 in his 14

innings and is expected to be in competition with Peter Handscomb for a position in the third Test lineup. If selected, elder brother Shaun is likely to move to number five with Mitchell slotting in at six, where his medium-pace bowling will complement the all-out pace trio of Mitchell Starc, Josh Hazlewood and Pat Cummins.

"I am renowned as the 'glue' of the fast bowling cartel," Marsh told reporters in Perth yesterday. "I did a bit of sucking up and I'm back in their WhatsApp group. The cartel are happy to have me back. I got invited to dinner last night. It was a huge honour," he added with a laugh.

While Marsh's improved batting had no doubt put him back in the frame, the all-rounder said his reconstructed shoulder was holding up well to the rigours of bowling. "Shoulder's feeling really good, body's feeling really good, got through the last two Shield games bowling, ready to go if I get the chance," he said.

"I know I'm in great form at the moment, I probably didn't expect to get back in so soon after my injury. I've worked hard over the last nine months to get my body back into shape. "If I get an opportunity to play, I'll bowl as many overs as Smudger (captain Steve Smith) needs me to bowl.

"Rhythm-wise, the ball's coming out really well, pace-wise I think I'm up where I was 18 months ago." Marsh added that his possible test return on his home ground, which was hard and generating good pace, would be special if he gets to play with his brother, but the job was to wrap up the series with two tests remaining.

"It'd nice to be back playing for Australia and playing with Shaun again, it's always special," he said. "But we're playing an Ashes test and we have an opportunity to win the series so all I'm focused on, if I get an opportunity, is doing my job for the team." — Reuters

HAMILTON: New Zealand congratulated themselves on a smart plan as they decimated the West Indies with a day to spare in the second Test to sweep the series 2-O yesterday. The tourists struggled to cope in their second innings against New Zealand's three-pronged fast bowling attack in Hamilton, particularly against a barrage of bouncers from Neil Wagner.

A brutal spell from Wagner produced three wickets and a broken arm as the hosts romped to a 240-run victory. The West Indies, set a target of 444 to win after losing the first Test by an innings, folded at nine for 203 with the injured Sunil Ambris unable to continue batting. "The way we were able to keep putting pressure on them with the ball and bat was a credit to the way we executed our plans," said captain Kane Williamson.



"Here the bounce became a little bit variable which is great in a Test match. You want to see the surface age a little bit and the way (the bowlers) were able to execute plans was outstanding.'

Wagner, who tormented the West Indies throughout the series with his aggressive short balls, took three for 42 while new-ball pair Tim Southee and Trent Boult grabbed two wickets apiece, as did spinner Mitchell Santner. The victory improved New Zealand's home record to 13 wins, three losses and seven draws in their last 10 home series.

'DIDN'T WORK OUT'

While Wagner was the chief destroyer, Williamson said the two significant factors were Boult and Southee's 61-run stand at the tail of the first innings and Ross Taylor's unbeaten 107 in the second. West Indies captain Kraigg Brathwaite laid the blame on his bats-



men for failing to learn from the first Test when Wagner took nine wickets. "We didn't bat well. The key was to take it over by over, session by session. Obviously it didn't work out that way," he said. "It's key to have your plans worked out and be very decisive in your shot selection." Ambris was taken to hospital after a vicious blow to the forearm during a blistering spell by Wagner. It ended a tough Test baptism for Ambris who made unwanted history in the opening Test when he became the first person to be out for a golden duck in his debut innings by stepping on his wicket.

In the first innings of the second Test, his misfortune continued when he became the first person to step on his stumps in consecutive Tests. Shai Hope, on 23, was also hit on the forearm by a rising Wagner delivery. When play resumed after medical treatment, he tried to take on Wagner only to be caught at long leg.

Shane Dowrich lasted two balls after Ambris left, fending a Wagner bouncer to Henry Nicholls at short leg. Roston Chase and Raymon Reifer manufactured a solid 78-run partnership until Chase, on 64, went in similar fashion to Hope, pulling a Wagner bouncer to the safe hands of de Grandhomme. Reifer was out soon after for 29 as the tail folded with the last three wickets adding 45. The series now moves to three one-day internationals and three Twenty20s with the tourists to be reinforced with the inclusion of Chris Gayle and Marlon Samuels for all six matches, while Andre Fletcher, Sunil Narine and Kieron Pollard will play the Twenty20s. —AFP

England on the brink at WACA house of pain

MELBOURNE: England's hopes of clawing their way back into an Ashes series fast slipping from their grip will be put to the ultimate test at the WACA where the tourists have won only once in nearly 50 years. The WACA bore witness to the meek surrender of the 2013/14 series by Alastair Cook's England, and at 2-0 down after Brisbane and Adelaide, Joe Root's men face a similar predicament when the third Test starts tomorrow.

With its traditionally quick and bouncy wicket playing to the strengths of home pacemen, the WACA has been a house of pain for English cricket and Australians will be hoping for more of the same when the ground hosts its final Test. One has to delve deep in the records to even find the last time England drew a match.

That was in 1986, when Mike Gatting's unlikely band of hard-partying tourists put on 592 in the first innings to frustrate Allan Border's team.

The maiden win was in 1978 when Mike Brearley's side thrashed Graham Yallopcaptained Australia by 166 runs, a victory that might otherwise have been remembered as a triumph of English cricket but for the fact that the hosts had been gutted by the World Series Cricket rebellion. Australia have beaten England in their last seven matches at the WACA and with the hosts' pacemen licking their lips, it may take something truly special from Joe Root's men just to keep the series alive to

the Boxing Day Test in Melbourne.

sorts, given England need only to square the five-test series at 2-2 to keep the coveted urn. Having fought hard but ultimately crumbled at both the Gabba and the Adelaide Oval, England's chances of rallying at the WACA have been given short shrift by bookmakers.

Their week has also included further off-field problems with coach Trevor Bayliss left fuming after English Lions batsman Ben Duckett poured a drink over the head of James Anderson in a Perth bar.

And yet, a small increase in application by the tourists could ensure a contest at the WACA. England have paid dearly for a few dreadful sessions and the scoreline has, to an extent, flattered Steve Smith's Australia.

The vulnerability of the home side's batting was on full display in the second innings at Adelaide Oval as they crashed out for 133 to raise England's hopes of an unlikely victory. Several of Australia's batsmen are under pressure, most notably number five Peter Handscomb whose place could be taken by Mitchell Marsh, an allrounder with a poor batting record at test level. Anderson and the England seamers, meanwhile, will have enjoyed a boost of confidence from Adelaide, where Craig Overton provided much better support than Jake Ball at the Gabba.

More will be needed from the English batsmen, though, given none have managed a century this series. Root and his most senior batsman Alastair Cook have been particularly culpable for failing to set the benchmark by converting promising starts into big scores. Both were present for England's last capitulation at the WACA and will be desperate to make a contribution to avoiding another. — Reuters



Kuwaitis, residents exempted from visas to attend 2018 WCup

KUWAIT: The Russian Embassy announced Kuwaitis and residents who want to travel to Russia to attend the 2018 FIFA World Cup are exempt from visa requirements. Gaidar Gamzatov, Counselor, Deputy Head of Mission, said at a press conference on Monday that special procedures are already in place. "All those wishing to visit Russia during the tournament are required to obtain a FAN ID from FIFA's official website (www.fifa.com) and have a passport. No bank statement or hotel reservations are required," he said.

Gamzatov noted people should not visit Russia only for the 2018 World Cup, but also because Russia is a beautiful country and has many places to visit to enjoy the beauty of nature and cultural heritage. "We invite them to take advantage of their presence there to enjoy the atmosphere of tourism in Russia," he added.

Bassel Al-Aswad, head of the Russian National Bureau of Tourism in Kuwait at Yaish Travel, said the company is ready for the huge number of people who have applied to attend the big event, adding economy class tickets are available online starting from \$200. Aswad said Yaish Travel is offering a "match hospitality" ticket and will provide the customers hotel rooms, travel tickets, free transportation and the FAN ID that gives them the free visa to Russia". He pointed out that all procedures will be handled by the travel company. He noted that Russia is keen on welcoming Gulf and Arab tourists, adding tourists are welcome to arrive 10 days before the date of the booked match and remain for another 10 days after the fixture.

New Shanghai boss Pereira vows to go one better than Villas-Boas

SHANGHAI: Vitor Pereira wants to go one better than predecessor Andre Villas-Boas by winning a title after being named coach of big-spending Chinese Super League side Shanghai SIPG yesterday.

The 49-year-old, who was once assistant to Villas-

Boas at Porto, has been out of football since leaving 1860 Munich following relegation to the German third tier in May. Pereira, who had notoriously poor relations with Dutch striker Robin van Persie before being sacked by Turkish giants Fenerbahce in August 2016, is tasked with breaking Guangzhou Evergrande's stranglehold on the Chinese Super League (CSL).

Villas-Boas left SIPG two weeks ago after a turbulent season failed to yield a trophy despite reaching the last four of the Asian Champions League, the final of the Chinese FA Cup and coming second behind Guangzhou in the CSL.

"The Chinese league is a big challenge at the moment, a lot of (foreign) coaches come here, a lot of good players come to this league at this moment," said Pereira, who plans to speak to his fellow Portuguese and "friend" Villas-Boas about the job

and "friend" Villas-Boas about the job.

"I will do my best to help the club to fight to achieve our goals. I know what the club wants and I know what I want for my career, and both of us want to win titles," he told a press conference at his unveiling. "This is the main reason why I decided to come here to China, to Shanghai. Together, for sure, we will reach our targets at the end of the season." Pereira was number two to Villas-Boas at Porto in the 2010-2011 season and together they won the Portuguese League, Cup and Europa League.

Villas-Boas subsequently left for Chelsea and Pereira took charge of Porto, lifting the Portuguese League twice, before spells in charge of Al Ahli in Saudi Arabia, Olympiakos in Greece and then Fenerbahce. SIPG boast a squad led by 60-million-euro attacking midfielder Oscar and his fellow Brazilian international Hulk, while in winger Wu Lei they have China's best offensive player. Hulk worked under Pereira at Porto and the new coach said he was looking forward to reacquainting with the powerful forward. "I was with Hulk at Porto for three years and I know the personality and the quality of the player," said Pereira. "For sure he

will help us a lot, but the key player for me is the team."
Compared to former Chelsea and Tottenham
Hotspur manager Villas-Boas and the Italian legend
Fabio Cannavaro at Guangzhou, Pereira is a relative
unknown to Chinese football fans and some SIPG supporters were quick to criticise his appointment.

"To be honest, from the bottom of my heart, I feel like he won't be able to control the dressing room," wrote one unhappy fan on Weibo, China's equivalent of Twitter. "Not really looking forward to his performance, but I hope the results will prove me wrong."—AFP



Dolphins snap Patriots' 8-game win streak

Cutler shines with three touchdown passes

MIAMI: Jay Cutler threw three touchdown passes as the double-digit underdog Miami Dolphins upset the New England Patriots 27-20 on Monday night at Hard Rock Stadium. Jarvis Landry caught two of Cutler's TD throws. After his second touchdown grab, he celebrated by pretending to inflate the football-perhaps mocking New England quarterback Tom Brady's "Deflategate" issues. Cutler completed 25 of 38 passes for 263 yards. Kenyan Drake led Miami's ground game with 114 yards on 25 carries. It was the second straight 100-yard game for Drake, who also had five receptions for 79 yards.

The Patriots (10-3), who visit the 11-2 Pittsburgh

Steelers on Sunday in what was looking like a battle for home-field advantage throughout the AFC playoffs, may have been caught looking ahead. Their eight-game win streak was snapped. Brady got off to a poor start, missing all four of his first-quarter passes. He completed 24 of 43 passes for 233 yards and one touchdown, but he was intercepted twice, both times by cornerback Xavien Howard.

Before Monday, Brady had just four interceptions all season and never more than one in a game. Miami (6-7) compiled an impressive 123-2 yardage advantage after one quarter but led just 6-0. The Dolphins scored on field goals of 30 and 44 yards by Cody Parkey. The first field goal was the result of a 13-play, 69-yard dive. The second was set up by an interception by Howard.

New England got untracked in the second quarter, taking a 7-6 lead on a 3-yard run by Rex Burkhead. On the next possession, Miami drove 80 yards in seven plays and took a 13-7 lead on a 5-yard touchdown pass from Cutler to Landry.

New England closed its deficit to 13-10 on a 46-yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski with two seconds left in the first half. Miami extended its advantage to 20-10 when Jakeem Grant made a spectacular, leaping, 25-

yard touchdown catch, crashing to the turf in the end zone. The Dolphins closed the third-quarter scoring with Landry's 4-yard reception for a 27-10 lead. New England crept closer as Brady's 3-yard touchdown pass to James White cut the deficit to 27-17 with 13:05 to

The Patriots, who had a first-and-goal at the Miami 1-yard line late in the fourth quarter, had to settle for a 33-yard Gostkowski field goal after getting hit with illegal-shift and holding penalties. Trailing 27-20, New England failed to recover an onside kick, sealing the win for Miami. — Reuters

Ribery taken to court by ex-agent

BERLIN: Bayern Munich star Franck Ribery briefly appeared in court in Germany yesterday over claims he owes 3.5 million euros (\$4.1m) to his ex-agent before the case was adjourned until January. The 34-year-old is contesting claims over unpaid commission from his 2007 transfer from Marseille to Bayern, which cost 25 million euros. A decision by Munich's district court has been postponed until January 16 because Ribery's former agent, Bruno Heiderscheid from Luxembourg, was unable to appear after his flight from Brussels was cancelled. Heiderscheid claims the pair made a verbal agreement a decade ago, which was later put in writing.

This is not the first time Heiderscheid has taken the footballer to court. In December 2015, Luxembourg's Court of Appeal ordered the Bayern forward to pay Heiderscheid 1.6 million euros, plus legal fees, for a breach of contract over the 2007 deal. Ribery is out of contract at Bayern in June, but has just returned from a knee injury.

He played in last Tuesday's 3-1 win over Paris Saint-Germain in the Champions League and Saturday's 1-0 victory at Eintracht Frankfurt in the Bundesliga.—AFP

Japan, S Korea set up East Asian showdown

TOKYO: An own goal from Ri Yong-chol gave South Korea victory over North Korea, while Japan downed China 2-1 to set up a showdown between the World Cup-bound nations for this year's East Asian Championship.

Japan's Gen Shoji scored with an effort from the edge of the centre circle three minutes from time to double his side's lead after Yu Kobayashi had put Vahid Halilhodzic's side ahead just three minutes earlier.

A penalty in stoppage time from China's Yu Dabao could not deny the hosts, who move to the top of the standings with six points having already defeated North Korea on Saturday, with South Korea second on

four points.

"It was a wonderful game and it was a wonderful win for my team," said Halilhodzic.

"In the second half we had some problems and like against Japan." — Reuters

China could create chances to score, but after that the quality of play was really good.

"We showed really good football and the combinations, especially up front, were really good. We had some very good chances to score but the ball didn't go in." South Korea picked up their first win of the competition after Ri deflected a cross from Kim Min-woo into his own goal under pressure from the opposition.

The win follows on from their 2-2 draw with the Chinese on Saturday to keep the pressure on Japan. A victory for Shin Tae-yong's team at the weekend will see them successfully defend the title they won in 2015.

"Japan are playing at home, but South Korea have very strong players and we want to show our strength because both teams are going to the World Cup," said Shin. "The best thing would be if both teams do their best and play to win and then everyone can be happy. We are preparing ourselves for that."

North Korea coach Joern Andersen has seen his side narrowly lose both of their opening games in the competition and the Norwegian claimed his players were overawed against the Japanese.

"It was a special game for us, for the players and the country, and I think in the first 30 minutes they were nervous and not as free as in the game against Japan," he said. "They were a little closed and not so prepared like against Japan." — Reuters

British inflation soars to 6-year high

Expensive Christmas this year as food prices skyrocket

LONDON: British inflation has hit its highest level in almost six years, official data showed yesterday, forcing Bank of England governor Mark Carney to explain the rise in an exceptional letter. The Consumer Price Index climbed to 3.1 percent on a 12-month basis in November compared to 3.0 percent in October, the Office for National Statistics (ONS) said in a statement. Analysts' consensus forecast had been for no change to the CPI reading. Carney must send a letter to British finance minister Philip Hammond, explaining why inflation overshot the Bank of England's 2.0-percent target rate by more than one percentage point. The open letter, which must outline what action the BoE's Monetary Policy Committee is taking to return inflation to target, will be published by the bank in February. Such a letter was last published a year ago, after inflation fell by



CB chief forced to explain rise to finance chief more than one percentage point below target in October 2016. The headline measure for November this year was spurred on by the high price of air fares, recreational goods and the rising cost of food and non-alcoholic drinks, the ONS said. It said that rising prices of computer games had a notable upward effect and higher transport prices were fuelled by the rise in Brent oil prices and a falling pound.

Expensive Christmas

"Christmas dinner is going to be a lot more expensive this year," said Frances O'Grady, head of the TUC umbrella body for unions. "Food prices have gone up at twice the rate of wages." Average wage growth continues to lag behind the rise in prices, meaning that real pay packets are falling. Financial Secretary to the Treasury, Mel Stride said

she recognized families were "feeling the squeeze". "We are determined to help," she added, pointing to recent pay-boosting measures by the Conservative government of Prime Minister Theresa May. Last month, the Bank of England increased its main interest rate for the first time since before the financial crisis, in a bid to tackle high inflation caused largely by the pound falling in the wake of Britain's vote for Brexit. "While the one rate hike so far was never meant to slay the inflation dragon straight away, (the latest inflation figure) will doubtless come as an unpleasant shock, and a sign that there will be further tough decisions in the months to come," commented Chris Beauchamp, analyst at online trader IG. "While inflation is expected to weaken in due course, potentially lessening the pressure on the BoE, it could be an anxious time over Christmas," the expert said.—AFP

US Treasury halts pension investments to avoid debt default

WASHINGTON: The US Treasury on Monday announced it was halting investments for two government employee pension funds in the latest move to avoid hitting Congressionally-mandated borrowing limit. The book-keeping moves are part of the effort to avoid defaulting on the US debt until Congress raises the debt ceiling from the current level of more than \$20 trillion.

Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin in a letter to Congressional leaders urged them to "protect the full faith and credit of the United States by acting to increase the statutory debt limit as soon as possible." Last week Mnuchin informed Congress the department would need to begin taking "extraordinary measures" to prevent a default as the government again bumps up against the debt ceiling.

The latest action means Treasury

The latest action means Treasury will not invest retirement savings held in two government pension

funds until Congress acts. Treasury on Friday suspended the sale of certain securities for state and local governments that count towards the debt limit.

While the Congress on Friday approved a stopgap spending bill to fund the government through December 22, it did not address the cap on borrowing, after the temporary fix expired December 8.

Because the federal government traditionally runs a budget deficit, it has no choice but to borrow to finance government operations, including salaries, retirement benefits, social spending and other expenses approved by Congress. Under the administration of former president Barack Obama, Congress repeatedly pushed the government to the verge of default as Republicans used the debt limit to force spending cuts. According to the Congressional Budget Office, President Donald Trump's administration likely can continue to function until spring while still making timely payments to meet its obligations, such as Social Security and Medicare.

Analysts say a default by the US would have catastrophic consequences for the world financial system.—AFP

Ryanair hit by further strike action

LONDON: Strike action at embattled Ryanair intensified yesterday, with German pilots the latest to plan possible walkouts over conditions, following similar moves by staff based around Europe.

Germany's powerful pilots' union said members would strike at Ryanair for better pay and conditions, although they insisted they would not disrupt flights over the Christmas holiday.

Pilots "announce a strike at Ryanair", the Cockpit union posted on Twitter. They aim "to force the start of talks to create employment and pay conditions for Ryanair pilots in line with the market", the union said in a statement. Ryanair had a "last chance" to avoid strikes by immediately coming to the negotiating table, union president Ilja Schulz said.

The Irish airline, which is cancelling thousands of flights because of pilot shortages, said it had not been notified of any industrial action by its German pilots. Unions have long complained that no-frills Ryanair does not offer pilots pay and conditions up to standards elsewhere in the aviation industry. German prosecutors searched offices belonging to the carrier at six airports last year, part of an investigation into possible tax evasion and withholding salaries against two British temp agencies that supply the Irish airline with



self-employed pilots. In its statement, Cockpit claimed pilots were leaving the airline "in droves" for the better conditions offered by other carriers, leaving Ryanair with a shortage of aircrew.

Italian pilots for the Irish carrier have already set dates for strike action, while Irish and Portuguese aviators have announced unspecified industrial action.

Ryanair said last week that it would "ignore" the Italian pilots' move, saying its staff rarely heeded calls to walk out. The carrier on Monday said some of its pilots in Dublin had voted for strike action.

The unspecified industrial action was backed by less than 28 percent of around 300 pilots based in the Irish capital for Ryanair, the airline said. Although the air-

line has around 300 pilots based in Dublin, reports said the strike ballot was issued to the 84 pilots directly employed by Ryanair.

The move comes less than a week after Ryanair pilots and flight attendants in Italy announced a four-hour strike for December 15. The planned industrial action comes after Ryanair said in September that it had to cancel 20,000 flights until March because of pilot scheduling problems.

Air traffic control delays and weather disruption also contributed to the cancellations. Despite such difficulties, Ryanair said last month it still expected to deliver annual profit after tax of 1.40-1.45 billion euros (\$1.65-1.71 billion).—AFP

Retail sector provides a healthy boost to price index

KUWAIT: Consumer price inflation bounced to a multimonth high of 1.4 percent in October, as inflation in the retail sector provided a healthy boost to the general index. Inflation excluding housing rent, food costs and energy prices, rose from 2.5 percent y/y in September to 3.3 percent y/y in October, highlighting some upward inflationary pressures from retail goods and services, growth in card spending (POS) accelerating to 12.5 perwhich coincided with the improving momentum in the cent y/y, following a systematic moderation in 2016. Card consumer sector.

The annual average inflation rate for 2017 is likely to ease to 1.6 percent, from the 3.5 percent annual average recorded in 2016. While there are some upward pressures from the retail goods segment and some services, these pressures are likely to be offset by continued softness in housing rent and food prices. Housing inflation remains subdued

during the third quarter of 2017. The slowdown in the real estate sector sales in 2015 and 2016 has led to an orderly and slow correction in property prices and rents. Housing inflation trended down from 2Q16 to reach deflationary territory in 1Q17. Housing inflation witnessed an uptick in

October to -0.3 percent y/y, due to basis effects. Local food price inflation remained soft in tandem with weaker inflation in global food prices. Inflation in local food prices advanced slightly in October to 0.4 percent y/y, following a flat month. According to the Commodity Research Bureau, inflation in international food prices contracted slightly. This weakness is likely to limit any significant increases in local food costs in at least the nearto-medium term.

Inflationary pressures in the retail sector rose in October, just as consumer spending continued to see improvement. Consumer spending improved in 3Q17 with

subdued

spending has bounced back as the sector stabilized. At the same time, inflation in the three major retail goods related components accelerated to near multi-month highs, with inflation in clothing and footwear accelerating to 2.9 percent v/v in October from 1.9 percent y/y the previous month.

Inflation in services excluding housing serv-

ices continues to trend downward in October on the back of fading price growth in transportation costs due to base effects. Despite the downward pressures from transportation prices, inflation in services excluding housing services remained supported by continued gains in inflation in the recreation and culture segment and steady inflation in restaurants and hotels. Inflation in restaurants and hotels was steady at its multi-month high of 3.0 percent y/y in October, while inflation in recreation and culture rose from 5.4 percent y/y to 5.7 percent y/y during the same period.

IMF: Sudan must float currency to boost growth, investment

CAIRO: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has urged Sudan to float its currency to boost growth and investment, a measure the government has opposed even after the United States lifted 20 years of sanctions in October. The government would need to accompany a market-determined exchange rate with other tough reforms such as expanding the country's tax base if Khartoum hopes to benefit from sanctions relief, the IMF said in a report published on Monday.

The Sudanese pound has weakened against the dollar since Washington lifted sanctions encouraging traders to step up imports, putting pressure on scarce hard currency. It hit an all-time low of 27 pounds against the dollar on the black market in November but strengthened to 23 pounds per dollar after a raft of emergency measures that included capping currency transfers and cracking down on currency traders.

The IMF said the end of sanctions was an opportunity for Sudan to strengthen its economic outlook but it required a currency float. "Fiscal policy should be tightened to eliminate the monetization of deficits, thus helping to reduce inflation and buttress macroeconomic stability," it said. It projected GDP growth of 3.25 percent for 2017, down from 3.5 percent in 2016.

The weakened pound has contributed to surging inflation, which reached 33.08 percent year-on-year in October, according to the Central Statistics Office.

The central bank has held the official exchange rate at 6.7 pounds to the dollar but currency is largely unavailable at that price. "The tax base should be broadened, energy and wheat subsidies phased out and replaced by increased cash transfers to the poor, and capital investment increased," the IMF said. The importdependent country has suffered both from the sanctions and from the secession of South Sudan in 2011, when it lost three-quarters of its oil output, its main source of foreign currency.—Reuters

Beirut redeveloper Solidere struggles through Lebanon's crisis

BEIRUT: The company formed to rebuild Lebanon's capital Beirut after its civil war ended in 1990 is struggling to overcome the latest period of political turmoil roiling the Middle East. Until the 2011 Arab uprisings and the start of neighboring Svria's civil war, Solidere's property business was booming along with Lebanon's real estate sector. But political tensions have put a security cordon around Solidere's glittering central Beirut showcase and scared off investors. Low oil prices also weigh on a market long dependent on petrodollars from the Gulf.

"(Investors) have to believe Lebanon is going somewhere stable to start to invest ... At the moment people are still in a wait and see mode, even though there are some bullish investors negotiating deals to benefit from the long-term value of downtown properties," Oussama Kabbani, Chief Operating Officer of Solidere International,

Solidere has sold no land this year, recording an unaudited net loss of \$18.9 million in the first half of 2017. But the company said some negotiations are in progress. Its reliance on land sales means revenue can swing dramati-

cally between profit and loss. However, the peaks are now much lower and the troughs deeper than a decade ago.

In response, Solidere is offering new deals to potential land buyers, has focused more on rent revenues and cut expenses. "Solidere is trying to make it easy for people who are serious to buy," said Kabbani, who was involved in drawing Solidere's original masterplan for Beirut.

Analysts say the scarcity of land in Lebanon and Solidere's ownership of prime sites mean the company has good value medium to long-term, but maintaining liquidity in the short term is more of a challenge.

Decline

The Lebanese Company for the Development and Reconstruction of Beirut Central District (Solidere) was founded by then prime minister Rafik Al-Hariri in 1994, aiming to finish its work and dissolve by 2019. But he was assassinated in 2005, prompting a series of political, security and economic crises in Lebanon that also pushed central Beirut into steady decline.

Solidere's mandate has been extended to 2029, but it still has around 1.7 million square meters of land to sell and shareholders received no dividend this year. Because of the tight security around the showpiece Place d'Etoile area near Lebanon's parliament, people cannot access the area freely and most shops and restaurants have closed.

Solidere has sold on most of the buildings there, but the area's decline has deterred investors. It has also reduced the flow of people to the adjacent Beirut Souks shopping

area, where Solidere makes money from rent. "There was a period where people from the Gulf, their dream was to come and sit ... to do nothing but sit and watch people going by," Kabbani said, referring to the boom years in 2004-05. "If we didn't have those security enclaves in Downtown, I'm sure Downtown could have continued to be the center of attraction."

Investor deals

Instead, land prices in Downtown have fallen by 1-2 percent annually and by around 15 percent in the past 5-7 years. In response Solidere plans to start converting unused office space into small apartments and is offering investors better deals. "Today Solidere might give you more flexible terms to pay (or) to develop, simply because it understands you are taking a country risk with your cash," Kabbani said. It is also trying to reduce costs and has cut overheads by 25-30 percent, he said. This included withdrawing from the London Stock Exchange because the low trading volume was not worth the fees.

Solidere's share price in Beirut, which peaked at around \$40 mid-2008, has declined to around \$8 today. Some of Lebanon's political problems appeared to abate earlier this year, only to flare again in November when Prime Minister Saad Al-Hariri, Rafik al-Hariri's son, unexpectedly resigned in a shock broadcast from Saudi Arabia — a move linked to conflict in the wider region between Riyadh and Tehran. He subsequently withdrew the resignation, with Western states pledging support for Lebanon's stability. —Reuters

UK pipeline outage sends oil price to more than 2-year high

LONDON: Britain's biggest oil pipeline from its North Sea fields is likely to be shut for a number of weeks for repairs, operator INEOS said yesterday, sending international crude prices to their highest since the middle of 2015. The closure has also

disrupted gas flows through the network, which carries a third of Britain's gas produced offshore. It has struck during a winter freeze in Britain, where snow and ice have driven up demand for heating fuel.

The pipeline, which carries about 450,000 barrels per day (bpd) of Forties crude, was shut on Monday after cracks were found. Benchmark Brent crude prices rose above \$65 per barrel for the first time since mid-2015. "We're hearing it will be likely down for two weeks," an industry

source familiar with the operations said. INEOS, which completed the purchase of the Forties pipeline system from oil major BP in October, said it was too soon

to say how long repairs would last but said that it would be "weeks rather than days." A minor leak had caused a partial shutdown on Dec. 7.

The pipeline has particular significance to global markets because Forties is the largest out of the five crude oil streams that underpin the dated Brent benchmark, against which other crude prices are broadly based. Forties is carried to Hound Point on the Scottish coast, where it is either loaded onto tankers, stored in tanks or piped to the 200,000-bpd Grangemouth refinery.

"If it's a lengthy outage, then a recovery period for the fields will be long as well," the trading source said. A number of producers including BP, Shell and Chrysaor, said they had closed down oil fields in response to the outage.

According to monthly loading programs, supply of Forties is expected to reach 21 cargoes of 600,000 barrels each this month, equal to a daily supply rate of 406.000 bpd. The closure has created havoc with loading schedules in the North Sea, with one trading source saving cargo owners had been offered options to drop cargoes from the loading program. "At this point we would expect a large deferral list for the Forties loading program to spill over into January," analysts from JBC Energy said in a note. —Reuters

NEW YORK: Soaring gasoline prices drove US rose 2.4 percent in the 12 months through November, wholesale inflation higher in November, with one measure hitting its second straight five-year record, according to government data released yesterday.

However, other signs of price pressures were muted, with less volatile categories holding steady or slowing. Producer prices rose in November as gasoline prices surged and the cost of other goods increased, leading to the largest annual gain in nearly

The fairly strong report from the Labor

Department yesterday suggested a broad acceleration in wholesale price pressures, which could assuage concerns among some Federal Reserve officials over persistently low inflation. The Labor Department said its producer price index for final demand increased 0.4 percent last month, advancing by the same margin for three straight

months. In the 12 months through November, the PPI shot up 3.1 percent. That was the biggest gain since January 2012 and followed a 2.8 percent rise in

Economists had forecast the PPI rising 0.3 percent last month and increasing 2.9 percent from a year ago. A key gauge of underlying producer price pressures that excludes food, energy and trade services rose 0.4 percent last month. The so-called core PPI had increased by 0.2 percent for two straight months. It the largest gain since the series started in August 2014, after increasing 2.3 percent in October.

The dollar advanced against a basket of currencies on the data, while prices for US Treasuries fell. US stock index futures were trading slightly higher. The broad rise in producer prices supports views that weak inflation readings experienced through the first half of the year have probably run their course. Some Fed officials had worried that the factors that had held down inflation early in the year could become more

persistent. The Fed officials were due to gather for a two-day policy meeting. The US central bank is expected to raise interest rates today, for a third time this year, with a robust labor market and strengthening economy expected to overshadow policymakers' earlier concerns about tame inflation.

The central bank tracks the personal consumption expenditures (PCE) price index excluding food and energy, which has undershot the Fed's 2 percent target for nearly 5-1/2 years. Last month, gasoline prices surged 15.8 percent, the biggest gain since August 2009, after dropping 4.6 percent in October. Gasoline accounted for two thirds of the 1.0 percent increase in the final demand goods index. There were also increases in the prices of light motor trucks, pharmaceutical preparations, beef, residential electricity and jet fuel.



November after increasing 0.5 percent in October. Prices for services increased 0.2 percent last month after increasing 0.5 percent in October.

Core goods increased 0.3 percent in November, rising by the same margin for a third consecutive

Wholesale food prices rose 0.3 percent in month. Prices for passenger cars increased 0.5 percent last month, the largest increase since December 2016, after being unchanged in October. The cost of healthcare services was unchanged last month after rising 0.3 percent in October. Those costs feed into the Fed's core PCE price index. —Agencies

Singapore launches electric car-sharing service

SINGAPORE: Singapore yesterday launched an electric car-sharing service, the latest transport innovation aimed at encouraging people away from owning vehicles and keeping gridlock at bay in the space-starved city-state. BlueSG, a subsidiary of France's Bollore Group, rolled out the scheme with 80 cars and 32 charging stations-which serve as drop-off and pick-up points — and plans to expand its fleet more than 10fold in coming years.

It is the latest effort by authorities in the tightlycontrolled financial hub of 5.6 million to prevent the sort of gridlock that has blighted other fast-developing Asian cities.

Officials have already introduced tough measures, including a license fee that has pushed the average car price to over \$80,000, a freeze on car numbers on the roads, and major new investments in public transport. The electric car scheme is being launched in partnership with the government, and the company hopes to eventually provide Singapore with the second-biggest electric car-sharing service in the world, after Paris.

BlueSG plans to increase the number of its cars to 100 by the end of the year, and is targeting 1,000 cars and 2,000 charging points by 2020. The specially-built Bluecars — four-seaters with two doors-are slightly bigger than a smart car and were designed with Italian coachbuilder Pininfarina.

Users will be able to book an electric car online or with a mobile app, and charged for the time they rent the vehicle rather than the distance travelled. There is also an option for a monthly membership



costing SG\$15 (\$11).

Marie Bollore, managing director of Bollore's electric vehicles division, said Singapore's high population density and well-developed network of roads made it an ideal launchpad for the company's foray into Southeast Asia.

Ngien Hoon Ping, chief executive of Singapore's Land Transport Authority, said he hoped the initiative

"will pave the way for greater adoption of electric vehicles in Singapore.'

The city-state's tough traffic-control policies have largely been a success, with its streets relatively clean, orderly and clear of traffic. But the rising price of cars and a series of recent public transport breakdowns have caused anger and prompted calls for the system to be improved. —AFP

ANZ Bank sells life insurance arm to Zurich for \$2.14bn

SYDNEY: ANZ Bank unveiled plans yesterday to offload its life insurance arm to Zurich for Aus\$2.85 billion (\$2.14 billion), making the Swiss giant Australia's largest retail life insurer by premiums. It follows National Australia Bank selling most of its life insurance business to Japan's Nippon and Commonwealth Bank shedding its insurance arm to AIA in recent years as Australia's top lenders streamline

ANZ said the sale of One Path Life Australia Holdings, subject to regulatory approvals, was another step in its strategy to create "a simpler, better balanced bank focused on retail and business banking in Australia and New Zealand".

"From the outset we've been focused on partnering with a high-quality organization culturally aligned to ANZ," said ANZ's Executive Wealth Australia chief Alexis George. "We're pleased we will be able to provide our customers with access to wealth products from one of the world's leading and most

respected global insurers." It described the deal as a good outcome for both customers and shareholders, citing Zurich's "commitment to innovation and strong presence in Australia". It follows ANZ's sale of its OnePath pensions and investments business to IOOF Holdings in October for Aus\$975 million. The bank's shares were 0.44 percent higher at Aus\$28.62 in afternoon trade.

Asia-Pacific in Zurich's sights

All of Australia's big banks are battling higher funding costs and lower interest margins, with rules now demanding they hold more reserves as a buffer against rising mortgage liabilities and fears over bad loans. They also face a hefty new government levy to raise Aus\$6.2 billion over four years through a 0.06 percent charge on the borrowings of the big five — ANZ, Commonwealth, Macquarie, NAB and Westpac. The Commonwealth sold its Australian and New Zealand life insurance business to AIA for \$3.0 billion in September, while NAB received US\$1.7 billion from Nippon Life for an 80 percent stake in its insurance arm in 2015.

As part of the agreement, ANZ and Zurich will enter into a 20-year strategic alliance to offer life insurance solutions through ANZ's distri-

Following completion of the deal, funded through cash and debt and expected to be finalized late next year, Zurich will be Australia's largest retail life insurer as measured by in-force premiums, with more than 1.5 million



customers, or 19 percent market share. The deal comes on the heels of a string of Asia-Pacific acquisitions by the Swiss firm, whose chief executive Mario Greco said it was a good fit for its growth strategy.

ANZ's portfolio of non-traditional and profitable retail products fits well with Zurich's strategy to focus on capital-light protection and unit-linked business," he said. Zurich's Asia-Pacific head Jack Howell said the region was an

important market for the company. 'Zurich has earmarked the Asia-Pacific region to be a major engine of growth in distribution and service capabilities, building on our recent acquisitions of Macquarie's retail life insurance business and the Cover-More Group," he said. "Importantly, we are acquiring a profitable business (ANZ's life insurance) with loyal customers and a track record of strong, stable cash

Fed to open policy meeting, rates hike likely

WASHINGTON: The US central bank was to open its final two-day policy meeting of the year yesterday, and is likely to raise the benchmark interest rate despite the absence of inflation.

It would be the third rate hike this year, and possibly the final time Federal Reserve Chair Janet Yellen presides over a policy move since President Donald Trump has opted to replace her in February.

Analysts say the booming labor market, which in recent months has pushed the unemployment rate down to 4.1 percent, the lowest in 17 years, will outweigh the Fed's perplexity over why inflation has stayed stubbornly below the central bank's two percent target.

And with Republicans in Congress working to finalize a unified final version of a massive tax overhaul that will slash corporate taxes, central bankers likely will be thinking about the measure's potential to add fuel to the economy and finally ignite price increases, economists say.

"Labor markets and prospects of fiscal stimulus outweigh soft inflation" in the rate decision, Barclays said in its Fed outlook note.

With the rate-setting Federal Open Market Committee widely expected to increase the benchmark lending rate, analysts will focus on the wording of the Fed statement and the quarterly forecast for hints about how fast rates are likely to increase next year.

Most economists see three increases again in 2018, but will watch to see if more Fed officials forecast four rate hikes or make any mention of the tax cuts' likely impact on economic growth.

Even so, "Further upward adjustment will likely have to wait until either the tax cut passes or there is sufficient evidence to suggest that inflation is firming faster than anticipated," Barclays said.

But Jim O'Sullivan of High Frequency Economics said "we expect officials will signal no let-up in tightening in response to a tight and still-tightening labor market." He is projecting four rate increases next year.

Job gains, while slower than last year, are running at 174,000 a month on average, and companies around the country are reporting difficulty finding workers to fill open positions.

Normally that would be expected to drive wage gains and fuel price increases, but the Fed's preferred measure of annual inflation has remained well below the two percent target, slipping to 1.6 percent in October.

The absence of inflation has baffled Fed officials and led to a split among those policymakers who want to go slow, and those who want to hike more quickly before price increases hit the

Yellen will preside over one more FOMC meeting in January, and then Trump's pick for central bank chief, Fed governor Jerome Powell, is due to take over in early February. —AFP

European equities rise as US Fed meets

LONDON: Global stock markets were higher yesterday, as investors girded themselves for this week's key interest rate decisions, with the energy sector boosted by firm oil prices.

Wall Street opened tentatively higher as the US Federal Reserve sat down for its last policysetting meeting of the year. On this side of the Atlantic, however, Germany's DAX was underperforming

Europe's other main indices, "losing ground amid a slightly stronger euro," said Accendo Markets analyst, Mike van Dulken.

Meanwhile, the Dow rose from record peaks early yesterday, lifted by a Boeing dividend boost and as investors prepared for a likely Federal Reserve interest rate increase.

Aerospace giant Boeing surged 3.2 percent after announcing it would increase its dividend by 20 percent and undertake a new \$18 billion share repurchase program.

Analysts expect shareholders to benefit from similar moves once the tax bill moving through Congress becomes law, even as President Donald Trump has touted the corporate tax cuts as a way to boost economic growth and job creation.

"If the tax cuts are approved and signed into law, those reductions should help boost earnings and cash flow, which are the fuel for dividend payments and share repurchases," Briefing.com analyst Patrick O'Hare said.

About 15 minutes into trading, the Dow Jones Industrial Average stood 24,492.20, up

0.4 percent. The broad-based S&P 500 added 0.1 percent to 2,661.50, while the techrich Nasdaq Composite Index lost 0.1 percent to 6,870.49.

In London, however, the FTSE was outperforming "thanks to a weaker pound versus the dollar and higher Brent Crude oil prices after a North Sea supply shutdown," the expert said.

London's FTSE 100 index advanced 0.3 percent in mid-afternoon deals and the Paris CAC 40 index won 0.4 percent, while Frankfurt's DAX 30 was only fractionally higher. "The shutdown of the Forties pipeline can have a durable impact on the price because it adds to the tighter supply picture brought about by OPEC's output cuts," said London Capital Group analyst, Jasper

Lawler. "We suspect... that Brent is on its way to challenge the 2015 high near \$68 per barrel." Some degree of profit-taking had set in by midafternoon, with crude prices coming off recent highs, the overall rise has energized the oil sector because higher prices tend to translate into bumper profits and revenues.


In London, Anglo-Dutch energy giant Royal Dutch Shell's 'A' shares jumped 1.4 percent to 2,445 pence and British rival BP gained 1.5 percent to 506.40 pence. French oil and gas titan Total saw its share price rally 1.6 percent to 47.84 euros in Paris.


Central banks in focus

Focus this week, meanwhile, is also on mone-

tary policy meetings of central banks in the United States, Britain and the eurozone. Today, the US Federal Reserve unveils its latest decision, followed on Thursday by both the Bank of England (BoE) and the European Central Bank.

"European markets are trading in positive territory, with oil stocks particularly buoyant after the shutdown of the Forties Pipeline sent Brent crude oil to a 30-month high," said Rebecca O'Keeffe, head of investment at online stockbroker Interactive Investor. "With all eyes on central banks this week, investors will be hoping that (ECB chief) Mario Draghi will remain the benevolent Santa Claus for markets and not turn into Scrooge," she told AFP. — AFP

Dutch classrooms empty again as primary teachers strike

AMSTERDAM: Elementary schools stayed closed across the Netherlands yesterday, as thousands of teachers went on strike for the second time in two months to demand higher pay and better working conditions. The previous one-day strike was in October, when eleventh-hour funding promises by the government failed to avert the largest work stoppage by Dutch primary school teachers since the 1980s. Prime Minister Mark Rutte offered them 700 million euros (\$825 million) in extra funds over the next four years, but they say they need double that to cover salary increases and pay for classroom assistants. Participation in yesterday's stoppage among the Netherlands' 100,000 primary teachers appeared to be high, with unions estimating around 90 percent of schools remained shut. The strike reflects growing frustration across the Dutch workforce, with employees in many sectors feeling left behind by strong economic growth that has not been matched by wage increases.

Primary school teachers have demanded a one-time 1.4 billion euro cash injection to bring their salaries up to the level of their counterparts in secondary schools, who on average earn 20 percent more. For many teachers the confrontation with the state is also about a serious labor shortage that has increased their workload. The Netherlands will have a shortfall of 11,000 primary school teachers by 2027, estimates by the Ministry of Education showed last month, while a pay gap with other professions is expected to grow.—Reuters



Four-million-dollar challenge to transform the world of people with lower-limb paralysis

Solutions will come from across the technological and design spectrum

The Toyota Mobility Foundation, in partnership with Nesta's Challenge Prize Centre, has launched a \$4 million global challenge, 'Mobility Unlimited Challenge,' to change the lives of people with lower-limb paralysis, culminating in the unveiling of the winners in Tokyo in 2020.

The Mobility Unlimited Challenge is seeking teams around the world to create a game-changing technology that will help to radically improve the mobility and independence of people with paralysis.

The Mobility Unlimited Challenge aims to harness creative thinking from across the world to accelerate innovation and encourage collaboration with users to find winning devices that will transform the world for people with lower-limb paralysis. The Challenge will reward the development of personal mobility devices incorporating intelligent systems.

The mobility solutions of the future could include anything from exoskeletons to artificial intelligence and machine learning, from cloud computing to batteries.

'We are delighted to launch this unique challenge, which seeks the world's innovators and problem-solvers to create gamechanging technology," said Takayuki Yoshitsugu, Chief Representative, Middle East and North Africa Representative Office, Toyota Motor Corporation. Around the world, millions of people have lower-limb paralysis (the most common causes being strokes, spinal cord injury, and multiple sclerosis). While there are no statistics on paralysis worldwide, the World Health Organization estimates there are between 250,000 and 500,000 new cases

of spinal cord injury globally every year.

Innovation in 'smarter' mobility technology has the potential to create personal devices that are better integrated with the user's body and the environment. But the application of this groundbreaking technology is slow due to disincentives such as small and fragmented markets, regulatory burdens, and reimbursement complexities from healthcare systems and insurers.

This can make the field unattractive to small or new entrants, and prevent innovative solutions by existing innovators from getting to market. Even though huge advances have been made in improving travel between places, innovation in every-day functionality still lags behind.

The Mobility Unlimited Challenge Prize is supported by a number of ambassadors from around the world, all of whom have experience of living with lower-limb paralysis. Global ambassadors include Aki . Taguchi, Director of Paralympian Association of Japan; August De Los Reyes, Head of Design at Pinterest; Turner-Prize nominated British/Nigerian artist Yinka Shonibare (MBE); South African rower Sandra Khumalo; Indian athlete and campaigner Preethi Srinivasan; British TV presenter Sophie Morgan; US track and field athlete Tatyana McFadden; and Dr. Rory A. Cooper, Director of the Human Engineering Research Laboratories at the University of Pittsburgh.

Ryan Klem, Director of Programs for Toyota Mobility Foundation, stated: "This is the beginning of our challenge - a three-year journey concluding in Tokyo in 2020. A journey where the greatest minds in technology, design, and engineering, from every corner of the world, will compete to make the environment and society more accessible for people with lower-limb paralysis. We know we don't have solutions yet; this Challenge is about working with the people who can help develop them."

Charlotte Macken of Nesta's Challenge Prize Centre, commented: "Challenge Prizes are a way to make innovation happen. The Mobility Unlimited Challenge is about the



freedom to move. It will support innovators, creating cutting-edge personal mobility devices incorporating smart technology and intelligent systems that will transform people's lives."

À panel of expert judges will pick five finalists who will each receive \$500,000 (equivalent to AED 1.83m) to take their concepts from an intelligent insight to a prototype. The Challenge winner will receive \$1,000,000 (equivalent to AED 3.67m) to make the device available to users? with the winning concept unveiled in Tokyo in 2020.

The Discovery Awards will provide seed funding of \$50,000 (equivalent to AED 183,000) for 10 groups with promising concepts, but who might otherwise lack the resources to enter the Challenge. Building on universal design principles to create a more equitable environment, entries for the Mobility Unlimited Challenge will be user-centered. The Challenge will be a catalyst for innovation through co-creation with the people around the world who will benefit most from the solutions discovered by our entrants.

At the end of the Mobility Unlimited Challenge, the Toyota Mobility Foundation and Nesta's Challenge Prize Centre will have supported teams of innovators in creating leading-edge technological solutions, opening a new chapter in personal mobility for people with lower-limb paralysis.

Tasmanian tiger doomed long before humans came along


SYDNEY: The Tasmanian tiger was doomed long before humans began hunting the enigmatic marsupial, scientists said yesterday, with DNA sequencing showing it was in poor genetic health for thousands of years before its extinction. Scientists genetically mapped the animal-also known as a thylacine-using the genome of a pup preserved more than a century ago in a jar. The research revealed the creature began to undergo a decline in genetic diversity more than 70,000 years ago, leaving it less resilient to environmental change even before Aborigines are believed to have first inhabited the continent 65,000 years ago.

"Our hope is that there is a lot the thylacine can tell us about the genetic basis of extinction to help other species," said University of Melbourne biologist Andrew Pask, co-author of a study published in Nature Ecology and Evolution. Pask added the research may eventually enable scientists to clone the Tasmanian tiger and bring it back from the dead. "As this genome is one of the most complete for an extinct species, it is technically the first step to bringing the thylacine back', but we are still a long way off that possibility."

The animal was once widespread across Australia, but was wiped out on the mainland around 3,000 years ago, having likely succumbed to drought. They survived in the southern island state of Tasmania until 1936 when the last known one died in captivity at Hobart Zoo after the species was hunted to extinction in the wild. Scientists found the genetics of the animal to be more closely related to fellow Australian marsupial the Tasmanian devil than the dog-like dingo with whom it shared many physical features. —AFP

Lily Allen drops first song in three years

The 'Smile' hitmaker hasn't put out any tunes since her album 'Sheezus', but surprised fans on Monday night, by dropping the coming-of-age banger about her wild past. On the track, she sings: "When I was young I was blameless/ Playing with rude boys and trainers/ I had a foot in the rave 'cause I was attracted to danger/ I never got home for Neighbors, hey/ When I grew up, nothing changed much/ Anything went, I was famous /I would wake up next to strangers/ Everyone knows what cocaine does/ Numbing the pain when the shame comes, hey (sic)" In October last year, Lily debuted a new track at Mark Ronson's show at The Savoy hotel in London. The 'Alfie' hitmaker took to the stage to perform three songs at the MasterCard Priceless event, including a brand new electronic dance track which she created with the superstar DJ. The 32-year-old singer was still learning the words to the as-yet-untitled track as she had to read most of it from a lyrics sheet. Speaking at the show, which was her first concert in over a year, Lily told the crowd: "I haven't played anything for about a year I'm really nervous." An album should be on the way from the British star as she told the audience then she'd been in the studio with Ronson, 42. Before performing the track, she said: "Mark and I have been in the studio a little bit this week." It was previously revealed Lily has teamed up with the 'Uptown Funk' hitmaker - her long-time collaborator - for her upcoming record and the producer said she'd channeled the heartbreak caused by her separation from Sam Cooper into her lyrics. Speaking last year, he said: "We've been writing together again on the new record. I feel like they are some of the best songs she's written. "Her voice sounds incredible. The stuff I'm working on is some of her most honest and heartbreaking music ever. She writes so honestly you can feel it." Mark said he believes the music world needs an "honest" star like Lily - who has two daughters, Ethel, six, and Marnie, four, with Sam back. He said: "She's like a needed performer. There's nobody really doing something like that, really honest."

Cabello praises artists for 'breaking barriers'

amila Cabello thinks there is a lot of "breaking barriers" in the music industry right now. The 'Havana' hitmaker is thrilled to see Latin artists getting mainstream recognition now and thinks there has been a big shift in the industry. She said: "I think that the good thing about social media and the internet is that I feel like it makes the world smaller and it just kind of breaks down barriers between languages, between people, between cultures, and I think that might have something to do with that. I've been listening to Spanish music forever because that's just not even Spanish music to me, it's just music "But I feel like with everything that's gone on this year and also with groups like K-pop groups performing on American award shows and making their way into the mainstream American industry, I just feel like there's a lot of just breaking barriers. Which I think is super beautiful, and I don't know exactly what there is to credit for that, but I'm definitely glad it's happening." The 20-vear-old singer likes to reference her heritage wherever she can. Asked on why she chose to give her 'Havana' video a telenova theme, she told Teen Vogue magazine: "I think that it's really important to represent and to be proud of your story, and be proud of who you are. And I think that being the most "you" is what makes you different. Also, for me, when I was growing up in Miami, I didn't really have anybody that shared my story to look up to. So that's why, for a long time, I thought that having a career in music was not possible for somebody like me that was in Miami. "I came from a family that didn't really speak English, and we had no money to move to LA and do meetings. That was not even in my vocabulary. So I think that's why, for a long time, it was only by chance that I auditioned for X Factor. If it weren't for that chance, I don't think that I would even be here. So I just think it's important for me to be authentic and to hopefully inspire young girls and young people that share a similar story."



Robbie Williams won't rejoin Take That in 2022

obbie Williams has ruled out a reunion with Take That in the next five years. The 43year-old singer has dashed hopes of him and Jason Orange rejoining Gary Barlow, Howard Donald and Mark Owen for shows and new music to mark their 30th anniversary in 2022. He told the latest issue of OK! magazine: "I'm in if it's a five-piece. I'd probably be in even if it isn't. "That being said, that's not on any calendar for the next five years." The Giants' trio have been eyeing getting Robbie and Jason back for what seems like years, and there was some hope when Gary said earlier this year that he thinks part-timer Robbie and Jason, 47 - who quit in 2014 - could return in 2022 for a "greatest hits" tour



and possibly a record. He said: "I don't think anything we do with Rob is going to relate to like a big 25-year project. "In fact, I'll tell you this for the first time, we're looking at 30 years. "We're planning something to do for the 30-year all together. We're looking that far ahead, something big, maybe a new record, maybe a greatest hits with a big tour." Whether that ever happens or not, that's a different story. My gut's telling me no. I'd love it to happen. "That's the nice thing, that we can all hope it will happen but, you know, no pressure on anybody to do anything." Gary - who announced a solo UK tour for 2018 - later admitted he'd given up hope on Jason rejoining the band. He said: "He didn't want creative involvement because we're day-to-day on this and he wanted to leave. "This has been weird with the whole Jason thing. He'd told us for a while, 'I don't want to be in music anymore, I don't want to do this anymore', and we'd push, push, push. "At the end of the day you've got to accept someone doesn't want to do what you're doing anymore."

Serge Pizzorno: Writing teams are spoiling music

🖊 asabian's Serge Pizzorno says artists who use a team of songwriters usually end up with tracks that "lack soul". The 'Processed Beats' star prefers it when musicians pen their own lyrics because they share a part of themselves with the listener. He told the Metro newspaper: "It's the 'writing team' thing. "I understand it, it's like American TV shows, the reason why they're so great is because 15 people in a room write it. "I can't deny the tunes they're writing. "I just have time for that band that gets in a room and smashes it, or a singer/songwriter ... you get them ... you get a feeling of their soul." The 36-year-old rocker says it's frustrating when other people get involved with writing music. He said: "I'm sure I speak on behalf of any songwriter trying to get something together. "You write one that's great then someone comes along, 'I wrote the top line melody', I wrote the chorus." One person, who he thinks is nailing it though, is 'New Shoes' hitmaker Paolo Nutini. Asked who



is doing a good job, he said: "Paolo Nutini. I love that guy." Serge's comments come after Kasabian frontman Tom Meighan said Arctic Monkeys and The Libertines are the only indie rock bands of the 2000s that survived. He said: "There's only us and the [Arctic] Monkeys left on that level. "They're great. Kaiser Chiefs too, probably. When we came out in 2004, you had Franz Ferdinand, Razorlight, Kings Of Leon, The Holloways, The Paddingtons, The Maccabees, Libertines had just finished. "It was just a good time. We were 22 and there was so much good music. Bands were back, there were loads of rock magazines, indie and rock 'n' roll were cool. We survived it." The singer concluded that rock 'n' roll was dead with pop music taking over. He added: "Where is rock 'n' roll at the minute? It's gone, isn't it? I reckon it's a mixture of everything. "What runs the world at the moment? It's R&B, pop, solo artists. Adele, she's amazing ... Ed Sheeran. There are no bands. "And Serge agreed: "Interestingly, they are the three - and the best three, which makes sense. We've got tunes, and strong, defined characters. Love them or hate them, you're interested in where they're going and what they're going to do."

James Mangold speaks out on Disney and Fox talks

ames Mangold thinks it would be "sad" if Disney buys the film side of 20th Century Fox. The 53-year-old filmmaker helmed Fox's recent R-rated success 'Logan' but Disney - which now owns Marvel Studios - is currently closing in on a deal to try and get back the rights for the iconic comic book characters. Fox owns the complete rights to both the 'X-Men' and 'Fantastic Four' franchises and any new character within its universe belongs solely to the studio - which led to the cancellation of the 'Fantastic Four' comic series. However, Mangold told Deadline that if Disney buys out the studio it would mean "less movies" will be made. He said: "If they're actually changing their mandate, if what they're supposed to do alters, that would be sad to me because it just means less movies. "The real thing that happens when you make a movie rated R, behind the scenes, is that the studio has to adjust to the reality that there will be no Happy Meals. There will be no action figures. The entire merchandising, cross-pollinating side of selling the movie to children is dead before you even start. And when that's dead, it means you're making a grown-up movie." The 'X-Men' franchise and spin-offs have been successful for Fox with both the Bryan Singer trilogy, the 'First Class' movies, the Wolverine standalone series and R-rated 'Deadpool' all doing very well at the box office. However, Marvel still does retain some input into the franchises and Fox needs Marvel to sign off on all TV deals regarding the superheroes, however, since the Marvel owns 'The Avengers' there has been some overlap with characters such as Quicksilver and Scarlet Witch - who have been members of both teams in the comics. Unlike the popular 'X-Men' franchise, the 'Fantastic Four' films haven't been as popular at the box office. In 2015, the franchise was rebooted starring Miles Teller, Jamie Bell, Kate Mara and Michael B. Jordan as the titular Four, however, the film was poorly received by fans and critics alike. These two franchises are not the only Marvel comic book heroes that belong outside of the Marvel Studios, with 'Spider-Man' being owned by Sony Pictures. However, 2017 saw the first time Marvel Studios and Sony have worked together on the fan favourite superhero after Marvel sold the rights in 1985 for \$225,000, with 'Spider-Man: Homecoming'. This collaboration meant that Tom Holland - who portrays the webslinger - is part of the Marvel Cinematic Universe rather than Sony's.

Anthony McCarten: Gary Oldman's gives defining performance in Darkest Hour

nthony McCarten thinks Gary Oldman took his portrayal of Winston Churchill to a "whole new level" and his work on 'Darkest Hour' is the "performance of his lifetime". The 56-year-old screenwriter wrote the new Joe Wright movie - which follows the hero British Prime Minister at the beginning of World War II - and McCarten thinks Oldman is more than a worthy Best Actor nominee at the Golden Globes. Speaking exclusively to BANG Showbiz at the UK premiere of the new movie at the Odeon Cinema in London's Leicester Square on Monday night McCarten said: "When you write a role like Winston you want to write a role that an actor, when they do it, will be magnificent. You have to write magnificent into the script but then someone has got to do it. And Gary then took what I did and took it to a whole new level and I think it's the performance of his lifetime or of most actors' lifetimes." 'Darkest Hour' tells the true story at the beginning of World War II and within days of becoming the UK's leader, Churchill must face one of his most turbulent and defining trials: exploring a negotiated peace treaty with Nazi Germany and deciding whether to back out of conflict in return for assurances Adolf Hitler's army will leave Britain alone. McCarten spent eight hours writing the script for the film and he admits he did a lot of research into the famous political figure to show sides of Churchill that hadn't be portrayed before. He said: "I did a bit more research and then found out, not only was there pressure, he yielded to it to some degree and seriously consider a peace deal but then he changed his mind and that was key. And I thought I want to write a movie about a guy who can change his mind. I thought that ability to change his mind was not something that we generally were lead to believe about Winston. "We've never seen the humorous Winston yet he is really beloved for his sense of humor but we've never seen him as a witty man, the witty Winston. And we have never seen a romantic Winston, the letters he wrote to (his wife) Clementine reveal a very romantic emotional side. So it was just all these colors to play with that no one has ever played with before and then you give it all to an actor like Gary Oldman and see what happens."

Speaking to Collider, Jackman said: "It's interesting because for the whole 17 years I kept thinking that would be so great, like I would love to see, particularly, Iron Man and the Hulk and Wolverine together. I look forward to joining the family and continuing the precedent set by this franchise's alumni of incredible filmmakers.' Jordan admitted he was "excited" for Caple to take over from the first film's director Ryan Coogler. He tweeted: "Excited for Coogler to hand over the reins to Steven Caple, Jr - our director for Creed 2! Can't wait to bring you guys the next chapter of our story ... coming at you November 2018. #Creed2 (sic)" Coogler is expected to join the movie in an executive producer capacity but a deal has not yet been completed. As well as announcing Caple's role, Stallone also teased fans that WWE star Brock Lesnar could be playing Ivan Drago's son in 'Creed II', but admitted a "new unknown" star will take on the role. Stallone wrote on Instagram: "Big challenges come in all shapes and forms!

Adorable or deplorable? Porgs stir debate in 'Star Wars' galaxy

The kids thought they looked cute

urry, wide-eyed and winged critters called Porgs are invading the "Star Wars" galaxy, and Walt Disney Co hopes they will soon be roosting under fans' Christmas trees. Porgs make their debut in "The Last Jedi," the new "Star Wars" movie that reaches theaters Thursday. Film trailers have offered only glimpses of a single Porg that rides shotgun on the Millennium Falcon and, in one scene, lets out a squawk. The limited view of their role has sparked questions: are the Porgs sweet or sad? Funny or irritating?

Cuddly creatures are rare in a movie franchise better known for metallic droids and the grotesque Jabba the Hutt, and their occasional appearances haven't always pleased fans. Many filmgoers believed the teddy bear-like Ewoks ruined the ending of 1983's "Return of the Jedi." "'Star Wars' fans, understandably, always have suspicion about anything that's too adorable," said Rian Johnson, who wrote and directed "The Last Jedi," in an interview with Reuters. But, he added, "I think the Porgs have their proper place in the movie. I think they fit." Fan reaction was mixed after a Porg appeared in a "The Last Jedi" trailer in October. Many embraced the creature as cute and huggable, but detractors speculated that Porgs might become the next Jar Jar Binks, a much-derided character



from 1999 film "The Phantom Menace." "I hate porgs," one Twitter user wrote in October. "I don't think they're cute at all, and I dislike how blatantly gimmicky they are."

Cast members have joined the debate. John Boyega, who plays Finn, likened Porgs to cockroaches in an interview, while Luke Skywalker actor Mark Hamill has rallied to their defense on Twitter.

When Disney showed "The Last Jedi" to more than 6,000 people at the movie's premiere on Saturday, the Porgs seemed to captivate audience members, who

laughed at their playful scenes with Chewbacca. Comments on social media were largely positive.

Holiday shoppers

Sales of "Star Wars" toys are important to Disney, which bought the franchise in 2012. "Star Wars" items were the US toy industry's top-selling line in both 2015 and 2016, with \$1.5 billion in sales over the two years, research firm NPD Group said. Disney licensees are already selling plush Porgs of all sizes, including one that measures four feet (over one meter) tall, to holiday shoppers at malls, online and at theme parks. If the Porgs take off, they could boost sales of plush toys, which accounted for just 2 percent of "Star Wars" US toy sales related to 2015 film "The Force Awakens," according to NPD toy industry analyst Juli Lennett. A Hasbro Inc Porg is the bestselling "Star Wars" plush toy in the 13 weeks ending Nov 25, Lennett said. Porg is the most searched for "Star Wars" character on the shopDisney website in December, Disney said. Jim Silver, editor-in-chief of toy review website TTPM, predicts Porgs will be popular with younger children, as Ewoks were. "As much as people criticized them, they sold a gazillion of them," Silver said. "The collectors say they didn't like Ewoks, but the kids thought they looked cute."—Reuters

Shining spotlight on slavery, dance helps survivors in UK find their feet

rabbed, groped and thrown to the ground, the young woman adopts the foetal position as the four female attackers loom over her. Dragged, kicked and strangled, the woman goes limp, drawing gasps from the audience as she lies lifeless on the stage. For the victim and her abusers are in fact performers, using theatre and dance to shock their spectators and throw a spotlight on modern slavery in Britain, while also helping survivors to regain their confidence through dancing. "Art is a very powerful way of speaking out about the issue," Erena Bordon Sanchez, founding director of The Natashas Project, a modern dance and theatre company set up in 2013, told the Thomson Reuters Foundation after a recent show in London.

While modern slavery is increasingly capturing the attention of the media worldwide, few in Britain have grasped the scale of a crime estimated to trap at least 13,000 people in the country in forced labor, sexual exploitation and domestic servitude. One in five people in Britain have never heard of modernday slavery, and more than half say they wouldn't know what to do, or who to talk to, if they suspected that someone was a victim, according to a poll in October by British supermarket Co-op.

"Our aim is to connect with the public, by portraying through dance what people might experience during slavery," said Sanchez, whose company also visits schools and youth groups to talk to young people about the drivers and signs of slavery.

Lifelin

On top of their performances and educational visits, The Natashas Project also holds dance sessions at shelters for survivors of domestic abuse, sexual violence and slavery. "We don't see it as therapy," Sanchez said. "It's about creating a community, having fun and building up confidence." For some women staying in shelters - abused, battered and broken - dancing offers respite from the horrors they have endured and the stress and uncertainty around their future. "Many of these women have suffered from the destruction of their sense of self, and their own worth," said Charlotte Desorgher, project director at the Company of Dreams, a dance group that offers free belly dance classes for women in refuges.

"We need to give them some fun," she said. "A giggle, some music and a dance is very powerful - it can lift the spirits." Yet dance classes can do more than just boost self-esteem. "A lot of the women say the classes have saved their lives, often those who have been abused or raped," Desorgher added.

'I feel free'

While there is no solid data on survivors of slavery in Britain, at least 3,800 possible victims were referred to the government last year. About half were women and girls and many came from countries such as Albania, Vietnam and Nigeria. These people are placed in safe houses and given help ranging from legal aid to counseling while the government decides whether to class them as victims of slavery - meaning that they may be allowed to remain in Britain in the short-term. Activities including arts and crafts, dancing and gardening provide a welcome distraction, and a creative outlet, to such people living in limbo, said Anne Read of the Salvation Army.

"Victims in safe houses often don't want to talk about their experiences, or engage with counseling services," she said. "Art, dancing, gardening ... they offer people another way to express themselves, to overcome the language barrier," added Read, the charity's head of anti-trafficking and modern slavery. While no survivors of slavery wanted to be interviewed in person or over the phone by the Thomson Reuters Foundation - for personal and safety reasons - two women were willing to share over email their thoughts about a recent dance session. — Reuters



e's the "king" of Indian cricket. She's a glamorous Bollywood She's a gramorous bon, ...

actress and former model. Newlyweds Virat Kohli and Anushka Sharma are celebrity royalty and India is cock-a-hoop over their marriage. "Officially India's First Couple," screamed the front page of Mumbai tabloid Mid-Day yesterday-a day after the pair tied the knot at a private ceremony in Tuscany, Italy. "Clean bowled!" read the Mumbai Mirror's headline, one of several newspapers to report the much-anticipated news using a cricket theme. Another publication wished them the best in their "new innings".

Kohli and Sharma, dubbed "Virushka" by local media, have generated the same sort of excitement and coverage in India as Britain's Prince Harry and fiance Meghan Markle have in the West. Both 29, Kohli is India's cricket captain and one of the world's highestwinning Hindi film star whose credits include the hit movies "Sultan" and "PK".

"We don't have a more powerpacked combination than this across Bollywood or the cricketing world. They can be called new-age royalty," Indranil Das Blah, a marketing executive, told AFP. Monday's wedding ended weeks of speculation in the gossip pages of India's newspapers and on the airwaves of the country's excitable 24-hour news channels that the couple had recently got engaged. But while messages of congratulations poured in from Bollywood and cricket stars, some pessimistic astrologers in India-where many are superstitious-struck a different chord by sounding a note of caution.

"While all seems to be perfect in their fairytale wedding, it might not be a very smooth sailing together for them in the years to come, predict

astrologers," read an article in Mail Today, ominously. Astrologers are concerned there may be "disharmony" and "disputes" in their marriage if they are unable to "maintain a balance between their personal and professional lives", it went on to say.

South African honeymoon

Kohli and Sharma started dating in 2013 after they met during the filming of a shampoo advert, and made their first public appearance a year later during a football match. Indian newspapers have been gripped by their four-year relationship-which included a reported break-up in early 2016 — and rumors of their impending nuptials intensified recently when they appeared in a wedding commercial together. Speculation then reached fever pitch when Kohli pulled out of India's limited-overs matches against Sri Lanka, and Sharma ducked out of before being spotted at Mumbai's international airport with her family.

The couple will host a reception in New Delhi for relatives on December 21, followed by a celebration in Mumbai on December 26 to be attended by Bollywood stars and cricketers. They will then honeymoon in South Africa before setting up home in Mumbai, the cradle of India's multi-billion-dollar Hindi film industry. Theirs is the latest in several marriages between Indian cricket players and movie stars over the years, from former India captain Mansur Ali Khan Pataudi and actress Sharmila Tagore to the recent Zaheer Khan-Sagarika Ghatge union. None quite has the star appeal of "Virushka" though. "Their brand value will definitely sky rocket. Companies will pay a premium to sign them up as it's a one-of-akind association," said Blah. — AFP

nimated comedy "Coco" showed much-anticipated release next week of A serious staying power holding on to top spot at the North American box office for its third weekend running, industry monitor Exhibitor Relations reported Monday. The colorful Pixar movie, which tells the story of Miguel (Anthony Gonzalez), a young Mexican who longs to be a musician and stumbles into the Land



of the Dead to unravel a surprising family secret, took \$18.5 million. Rewarded with a Golden Globe nomination on Monday, "Coco" has taken \$135.7 million since its release over the long Thanksgiving weekend, and is already the top-grossing film ever in Mexico.

It is one of just four films to lead the North American box office for three weekends in a row this year, according to entertainment industry weekly Variety. But that is expected to change with the

"Star Wars: The Last Jedi," predicted to net up to \$220 million in its opening weekend. Second on North American screens this weekend was "Justice League," taking in \$9.7 million, for a fourweek total of \$212 million.

The Warner Bros movie features Gal Gadot as Wonder Woman, Ben Affleck as Batman, Henry Cavill as Superman and Jason Momoa as Aquaman, plus Ciaran Hinds as a supervillain. Third was Lionsgate's feel-good film "Wonder." which netted \$8.4 million. The movie, starring Julia Roberts, Owen Wilson and Jacob Tremblay, tells the story of a determined fifth-grade boy with a facial deformity who must deal with rudeness and bullying by schoolmates.

Shooting up to fourth place was "The Disaster Artist," distributed by A24, a comedy-drama directed by James Franco about the making of 2003 cult movie "The Room," reputedly one of the worst films ever. Starring Franco, Seth Rogen and Alison Brie, "The Disaster Artist" took in \$6.4 million for the weekend. In fifth was 'Thor: Ragnarok," featuring the self-effacing humor of Chris Hemsworth as the powerful Norse god and Cate Blanchett as death goddess Hela. The Disney film netted \$6.3 million, bumping up its six-week total to \$301 million.

US fil mmakers in Kuwait film a documentary on Nellie Mae Rowe's life

In the world of art, many are admired for being self-taught. Some of them are unknown and unrecognized, yet they certainly leave a remarkable imprint on the world. One out of them was Nellie Mae Rowe, an African-American selftaught artist from Favette, Georgia. People respect her for her simple yet expressive work. Relatively unknown during her lifetime, she is now recognized as one of the most important American folk

When US filmmakers found out that Dalal Al-Nafisi, an art studio owner and an art school founder, teaches Rowe as part of her art curriculum, they decided to visit Kuwait. The two filmmakers - Petter Ringbom (Swedish) and Ruchi Mital (American) - are here to film "This World is Not My Own", a creative documentary on the life



Nellie Mae Rowe (1900-1982)


and influence of Rowe (1900-1982). Rowe's work can be seen at the American Folk Art Museum in New York City, the High Museum of Art in Atlanta and the Smithsonian American Art Museum in Washington, DC, among other venues.

Why in Kuwait?

Dalal is an alumna of the Rhode Island school of Design and the Design Institute of San Diego, California. At her school, she has featured several unknown but exemplary unique artists from all around the world. One of the artists is Rowe, whose work is not just displayed in the studio, but is being used as a part of the 'Manifesto13' art curriculum. Dalal said Rowe deserves the highest respect and recognition. Although her work was not widely known when she was alive, her legacy remains as a self-taught artist.

"My art school is located in Hawally. It is very essential and it is our goal to bring such unique art to the people," Dalal said. "We want to use art in social awareness campaigns to connect with children, and perhaps help these kids become more aware of what's going on in our society," she added. Launched in 2014, Manifesto13 teaches several works of international artists. "Nellie Mae Rowe's work is on level 3 of our art foundation program Manifesto13. One of the many reasons why I love Rowe's work is because kids can connect to it easily and it emphasizes on the importance of self-expression," she said.

Rowe's art is all about self-expression - one very a distinct characteristic of her art is how she

uses art as a tool, especially while sending out a message. She expresses every tiny detail and essence of personal issues through art. The work of Nellie Mae Rowe has been regarded as the easiest to understand by kids - children love her work; they can relate to it faster than adults. "Art is selfexpression - people can explore regardless of education and background as she herself came from a poor family," Dalal said.

The two filmmakers who were invited by Dalal conducted a lecture yesterday on documentary and filmmaking titled "Storytelling through Film, Globally and Locally: An American Artist Inspires' at GUST's Global Studies Center. "We are producing a documentary on the life of Nellie Mae Rowe. Though she was a black woman from a poor background, she gained respect for her work in the early 1900s. She was a self-taught artist and her work has been exhibited in many countries around the world," said Ringbom.

Ringbom pointed out that Rowe wasn't very well-known, but her work has been labeled as the best example of self-empowerment. "At the art school in Hawally, we are going to film how her story is being relayed to art students at Manifesto13. We will also document the class and the process of teaching children through her work," said Ringbom.

Dr Zennia Paganini said since the past two years as the US Embassy's cultural attache, she has facilitated about three visits of several filmmakers to Kuwait, some of them channeled through various NGOs. "They are here for a documentary and lecture. This lecture is a part of the Public Affairs Section's ongoing programming on the theme of filmmaking in support of the creative economy. We support local filmmakers. There are many young Kuwaiti filmmakers who are very keen to know more about the filmmaking industry, so we are here to support these young people interested in entrepreneurship through this form of the artistic genre," Paganini noted.

Recent activities include visits by Kohl Glass and Tim Skousen, who conducted a workshop and lectures for filmmakers and university students in Oct 2016, and Bill Megalos, who held a workshop for local filmmakers at LOYAC in Nov 2016.

uchi Mital is a filmmaker, producer, and writer with a social justice background. In 2014, Ruchi produced a feature documentary, 'We Could Be King,' which won the Emmy for outstanding sports documentary, as well as the follow up short doc series, Hell Week [ESPN]. Her next production, Sky Ladder: The Art Of Cai Guo-Qiang, premiered at the 2016 Sundance Film Festival. She is currently producing a documentary series for HBO about the women's movement; and a feature-length hybrid documentary about the artist Nellie Mae Rowe: 'This World Is Not My Own.'

Her experimental short films have screened at festivals from NYC to UK. Ruchi spent over a decade working in non-profit organizations and published a chapter in critical anthology, Michael Jackson: Grasping the Spectacle. Ruchi is a graduate from New York University and holds a Masters in Media Studies from The New School.

Petter Ringbom's debut feature documentary 'The Russian Winter,' premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival in 2012. After near decade, Beyonce back on top of US song chart

eyonce, with little argument one of the top stars in pop music, Monday ended an Dunlikely drought-nine years since she had a number-one US song. Beyonce hit the top of the Billboard Hot 100 chart for her new duet with Ed Sheeran on a remix of the English songwriter's "Perfect," a tender guitar ballad. The song sold 181,000 digital downloads in the week through Thursday on the benchmark US singles chart, which also tracks streaming and radio airplay. "Perfect" is Beyonce's first tune to lead the Hot 100 since December 2008 with "Single Ladies (Put a Ring on It)," her blockbuster dance anthem of female empowerment.

Beyonce moved in a more experimental direction with her latest album "Lemonade." But she initially released it last year as an exclusive on


Tidal, the streaming service led by her husband Jay-Z, impeding the chart performance of individual tracks. "Drunk in Love," her duet with Jay-Z off her self-released 2013 album, only reached number two on the Hot 100. The longest gap between number one songs in the chart's history belongs to Cher, who waited nearly 25 years between her 1974 hit "Dark Lady" and her 1999 chart-topper "Believe." — AFP

Seeking music edge, Apple buys song recognition app Shazam

Pregnant woman wants seat on Tokyo metro: There's an app for that



Pregnant women struggling to bag a seat on the famously packed Tokyo subway could find their salvation in a new app connecting them with nearby passengers willing to give up their coveted perch. The digital match-making app being trialled this week on the metro aims to overcome two problems especially prevalent in Japan: passengers generally have their nose buried in their phones and talking is strictly frowned upon. The service allows a pregnant woman to send a message when she wants a seat.

The app will then look for generous pre-registered users who have said they are willing to give up their seats. If there is a match, the pregnant woman gets a seat map on her smartphone screen showing her partner's location. The exchange can be made without giving personal information to each other. Printing and IT firm Dai Nippon has been testing the service this week on one of the key subway lines in conjunction with Tokyo Metro and the Line messaging app company.

"This may be particular to Japan but some people hesitate to speak to a person who may need a seat," said a spokeswoman at Dai Nippon Printing involved in the project. "Many people are also looking at smartphone screens and do not always realize quickly that someone in need is standing nearby," said the official, who declined to be named. "We try to take advantage of the situation." It is yet to be decided when the service will be rolled out but the companies also hope to expand assistance to elderly and disabled people. Japan has one of the world's lowest birth rates and authorities are trying out several policies to encourage people to have more children. — AFP

pple said Monday that it would buy leading song recognition app Shazam in a fresh bid to secure an edge in the intensifying battle of streaming services. Apple, whose streaming service has rapidly grown but still has only half the paid subscribers of Spotify, said that Shazam has consistently been one of the most popular items on its App Store. The two companies did not disclose financial terms. The technology news sites Recode and TechCrunch, quoting unnamed sources, both put the deal at around \$400 million.

The market signaled its approval, with Apple share prices jumping 2.0 percent, well outpacing the 0.2 percent rise on the Dow Jones Industrial Average. "Apple Music and Shazam are a natural fit, sharing a passion for music discovery and delivering great music experiences to our users," Apple said in a statement. London-based Shazam said in a separate statement: "We can't imagine a better home for Shazam to enable us to continue innovating and delivering magic for our users."

Shazam, which was founded in 1999 in the early age of online music, has offered a solution to a longtime agony of listenersputting a name to elusive songs. With a click, the app identifies tracks playing on the radio, at parties or as background music. But Shazam has struggled to find a way to make money off its technology, even as it said that it had reached one billion downloads on smartphones last year.

Shazam only recently announced it had become profitable, thanks to advertising and steering traffic to other sites such as Spotify and Apple Music. The technology is also no longer quite as novel, with Shazam facing rivals such as SoundHound and with smartphones capable of ever more advanced recognition functions. Mark Mulligan, who writes a popular blog on the music industry, described Shazam as "cool tech without a business model" and said Apple was a rare player that could bring out the app's value.

Facing tough competition

The world's most valuable publicly traded company, Apple earns most of its revenue from iPhones but has also found it vital to be seen on the cutting edge culturally. Apple, which revolutionized online music a generation earlier with iTunes, in 2015 launched Apple Music as the market turns to streaming, which offers unlimited on-demand listening. Apple said in September that the service had more than 30 million subscribers-a quick rise, but still trailing

Spotify. Spotify-which has emphasized a barebones, user-friendly interface instead of unique features-said it had 60 million paying users as of July and 80 million more on its free tier. And with streaming experiencing rapid growth, competition has become even fiercer. Retail giant Amazon seized on its vast consumer reach as it launched its own streaming service last year. YouTube,

the video-sharing behemoth owned by Apple's rival Google, also has its own music streaming platform and recent reports said it was looking to launch a new paid subscription package next year.

Tech battle turns to services

Shazam has already proven it can be woven into another service. A year ago, it formed a partnership with SnapChat, the youth-driven social media platform whose videos evaporate, with users able to "snap" to friends the music they discover around them on Shazam. Neil Saunders, managing director of GlobalData Retail, said the Shazam sale "underlines the fact that the battle of the technology companies is firmly moving beyond hardware and into services."

"This is a good move for Apple that helps to consolidate its already strong position in music content. It won't be the last takeover of a tech firm by these big giants," he said. Apple has already invested in buying bigname music brands, in 2014 paying an eyepopping \$3 billion for Beats Electronics, the headphones, speaker and streaming brand of rapper Dr Dre. Soon afterward, it bought Semetric, a British company that tracks music consumption on behalf of labels and artists.—AFP
