### ISRAEL REMOVES METAL DETECTORS AMID BOYCOTT

JERUSALEM: Israel removed metal detectors from a highly sensitive Jerusalem holy site yesterday after their installation triggered deadly violence, but Muslim worshippers suspicious over what would come next kept up a boycott. Israel's move came in the face of intensive international diplomacy seeking to prevent the dispute over the Haram Al-Sharif mosque compound, known to Jews as the Temple Mount, from sparking wider Palestinian unrest.

The government said it would introduce subtler measures instead to secure the compound housing the revered Al-Aqsa mosque and Dome of the Rock, following a July 14 deadly attack on Israeli police nearby. A work crew removed the metal detectors from one entrance to the compound early yesterday, and cameras installed on overhead scaffolding in recent days were also gone. But suspicions over what the new measures would entail resulted in the boycott continuing.

Several hundred worshippers prayed outside the gates in the streets in the summer heat, as they have done since the metal detectors were installed more than a week ago. "What we want and what we demand is for everything to return how it was before July 14," said Mohammed Hijazi, who came several days ago from Acre in northern Israel to join the protests. "When that happens we are ready to return to enter the Al-Aqsa mosque to pray to God Almighty." Israel's security cabinet announced the decision to remove the detectors early yesterday.

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia and its allies unveiled a "terrorist" blacklist yesterday of 18 organizations and individuals suspected of links with Islamist extremism that they said had ties with regional rival Qatar. The move by the four Arab governments came despite mounting international pressure to compromise in their weeks-old boycott of their fellow US ally. Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Egypt last month released a list of 59 people and 12 groups they alleged had links to Qatar, accused by the four states of ties to extremist groups in the region. Qatar has denied the allegations.

Yesterday's list blacklisted nine charity and media organizations and nine individuals "directly or indirectly linked to Qatari authorities" as "terrorist", read a joint statement released by the four states. "We expect Qatari authorities to take the next step and prosecute the terrorist groups and people," the statement said. "The four countries and their international partners will ensure that Qatar has ceased its support and funding of terrorism, has stopped welcoming terrorists and has stopped spreading extremist and hate speech," it added.

The Saudi-led bloc, which now blacklists 89 persons and organizations accused of ties to Islamist groups they say are backed by Qatar, also dismissed an amendment last week to Doha's counter-terrorism law as "insufficient". Saudi Arabia and its allies have been boycotting Qatar since June 5 in the region's worst diplomatic crisis in years. They sealed the emirate's only land border, ordered its citizens to leave and closed their airspace and waters to Qatari flights and shipping.

They demanded that Qatar break its longstanding ties with the Muslim Brotherhood, blacklisted as a "terror group" by the four governments although not by the international community.

### **IRAN'S TECH SECTOR BLOOMS UNDER SHIELD OF SANCTIONS**

**TEHRAN:** The names may be unfamiliar but the services are immediately recognizable: Snapp is Iran's answer to Uber, Digikala is its Amazon, and Pintapin its Booking.com. US sanctions have protected the Islamic republic's tech sector, barring Silicon Valley from profiting from one of the world's most promising emerging markets, and giving a free run to domestic start-ups to recreate their services. Even some Californian mumbo-jumbo has been imported: one booth at the Elecomp tech fair in Tehran this week claimed it was "Creating Artificial Mindfulness".

But don't dare call them copycats transplanting a foreign business model to Iran is never straightforward. "It's not a matter of copying code line-by-line," said Amirali Mohajer, the 32-year-old chief operating officer of Pintapin. "You need local expertise that has to be built from the ground up, and it might need an entirely different business model to make it successful." His office sits alongside several other fast-growing start-ups in the

offices of the Iran Internet Group (IIG), a haven of north Tehrani hipsterdom where the jeans are skinny, the headscarves loose, and 20-somethings sip espressos in glass meeting rooms.

Pintapin's staff are not just building a website, they are transforming Iran's entire hotel industry. "Up until very recently, a lot of travel arrangements were done completely offline through phone calls and faxes and traditional models that really belong in the last century," said Mohajer. Half the company's time is spent convincing hotels to give up pen-and-paper reservations and start automating their business. Mohajer, who spent 16 years abroad in Britain and Canada, says he came back to Iran because it felt like a place where tech could have "an impact that actually matters". "We really believe we're working towards creating Iran's rightful place in the worldwide travel market... helping reconstruct an Iranian identity that's been unfortunately damaged due to political issues."

# HIJAB GOES MAINSTREAM AS ADVERTISERS TARGET MUSLIMS



oversubscribed sukuk RIYADH: Saudi Arabia has raised \$4.53 billion from a local Islamic bond issue that was three times oversubscribed, it said yesterday as it battles a budget deficit caused by low oil revenues. The finance ministry said orders exceeded 52 billion riyals (\$13.6 billion) for its first issue of domestic sukuk bonds worth 17 billion riyals. It said the new bonds would be divided into three tranches, with maturities ranging from five to ten years. "The strong demand for local bonds reflects the confidence of investors in the kingdom's issuings and confirms the strength of the Saudi economy's foundations," the ministry said in a statement.

### **US navy fires warning** shots at Iranian vessel

WASHINGTON: A US navy patrol ship fired warning shots at an Iranian Revolutionary Guard vessel in the Arabian Gulf yesterday after it approached within 150 yards, a US defense official said. "The IRGCN boat was coming in at a high rate of speed. It did not respond to any signals, they did not respond to any bridge-tobridge calls, they felt there was no choice except to fire the warning shots," the defense official told AFP. The incident occurred at about 3:00 am local time (0000 GMT) in the northern Gulf, when the Iranian vessel began to approach the USS Thunderbolt. After the US ship fired the warning shots, the Iranian vessel stopped, the official said, at which point the Thunderbolt continued on her way.

BEIRUT: The hijab - one of the most visible signs of Islamic culture - is going mainstream with advertisers, media giants and fashion firms promoting images of the traditional headscarf in ever more ways. Last week, Apple previewed 12 new emoji characters to be launched later this year, one of a woman wearing a hijab. Major fashion brands from American Eagle to Nike are creating hijabs, while hijab-wearing models have started gracing Western catwalks and the

covers of top fashion magazines. Many Muslim women cover their heads in public with the hijab as a sign of modesty, although some critics see it as a sign of female oppression. But there is one thing most can agree on: when it comes to the hijab, there is money to be made. "In terms of the bottom line - absolutely they're (young Muslims) good for business ... it's a huge market and they are incredibly brand savvy, so they want to spend their money," said Shelina Janmohamed, vice-president of Ogilvy Noor, a consultancy offering advice on how to build brands

that appeal to Muslim audiences. Nike announced it is using its prowess in the sports and leisure market to launch a breathable mesh hijab in spring 2018, becoming the first major sports apparel maker to offer a traditional Islamic head scarf designed for competition. In June, Vogue Arabia featured on its cover the first hijabi model to walk the international runway, Somali-American Halima Aden, who gained international attention last year

when she wore a hijab and burkini during the Miss Minnesota USA pageant. "Every little girl deserves to see a role model that's dressed like her, resembles her, or even has the same characteristics as her," Aden said in a video on her Instagram

Hijabs have also become more visible in Western advertising campaigns for popular retailers like H&M and Gap. "Brands especially are in a very strategic and potent position to propel that social good, to change the attitudes of society and really push us forward and take us to that next step," Amani Al-Khatahtbeh, founder of online publication MuslimGirl.com, said by phone from New York.

In Nigeria, a medical student has become an Instagram sensation for posting images of a hijab-wearing Barbie, describing hers as a "modest doll" - unlike the traditional version.

### **GOVT COMMITTED TO** TRANSPARENCY ON STATE'S FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

**KUWAIT:** Kuwait's Ministry of Finance for Egypt's fight against terrorism, Monday affirmed complete commitant and its policies to maintain security ment to transparency with regards to the state's financial conditions, saying it was ready to clarify all relevant queries. The ministry said Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Anas Al-Saleh, Managing Director of Kuwait Investment Authority and ministry officials met with members of Kuwait Economic society, regarding the society's statement over withdrawal from the general reserve. The government delegation clarified some issues in the society's statement which were not reported in details by the media. The delegation thanked the society for its interest in financial issues.

### **Gulf crisis**

Meanwhile, the cabinet met on Monday following Turkish Prime Minister Recep Tayyip Erdogan's visit as the region was witnessing a flurry of diplomacy over the Gulf crisis. His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, who chaired the meeting at Bayan Palace, briefed the ministers about Erdogan's talks with His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, which dealt with regional and international affairs. Erdogan, who visited Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Qatar, has reiterated support for the mediation of Kuwait to solve the Gulf crisis.

Meanwhile, First Deputy Premier and Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah briefed the cabinet about his recent visit to Egypt and his meeting with President Abdelfatah Al-Sisi, which dealt with coordination and consultations over regional and international issues, notably how to address the Gulf crisis, Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah Al-Sabah, Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs and Acting Information Minister, said in a statement after the cabinet meeting. Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled reiterated Kuwait's support and stability nationwide. He also briefed the cabinet about outcome of EU Foreign Policy Chief Federica Mogherini's recent visit to Kuwait and her talks with His Highness the Amir and the Foreign Minister, all regarding means of solving the Gulf crisis.

On the other hand, Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled talked about notification sent to the Iranian Ambassador to Kuwait to reduce number of diplomats, close all technical offices and freeze joint committees. Deputy Premier and Defense Minister Sheikh Mohammad Khaled Al-Hamad Al-Sabah briefed the cabinet about his representation of His Highness the Amir at the inauguration of Egypt's Mohammad Nejeeb Military Base, and his delivery of a letter from His Highness the Amir to Al-Sisi.

### **Final statements**

The cabinet then approved draft laws of final statements for 2016-17 fiscal year for government institutions, and referred them to His Highness the Amir. The ministers, upon instructions of His Highness the Prime Minister, decided to refer to the State Audit Bureau (SAB) uncertainties surrounding final statements of some government authorities in order to guarantee transparency. The government assigned the technical authority of the privatization program to prepare legal environment for the privatization of some state-owned facilities. At the external front, the cabinet strongly condemned the Israeli occupation authorities' security measures in Al-Aqsa Mosque, and urged the international community to put an end to the Israeli "criminal acts" to pave way for worshippers to pray in peace. The government congratulated Sultan Qaboos bin Saeed of Oman on the national day, and welcomed the election of Ram Nath Kovind as the president of India. —KUNA

### GERMANY TODAY - PART II

o we need a new policy to combat trafficking in heritage objects? I would say definitely yes. The Arab world faces the threat of loss of identity, including theft and destruction of monuments and museums. So I believe institutions like the German Archaeological Institute can help countries facing civil wars and conflicts to preserve their heritage by helping their citizens do so. It is not only institutional work, but humane and important too.

It is a great and noble intuitive from the Germans to support developing countries to preserve their heritage, and I see UNESCO taking a bigger part in this as a matter of pride. It is imperative to face the dangers of theft of antiquities by training security forces and authorities at all ports to firmly stop any such illicit attempts, whether by individuals or institutions. This requires collective action and international cooperation, like the war against terror. This is a serious issue that affects the history of countries. I believe Germany has all the resources to support such a global action in cooperation with

Our group paid an important visit to the German Commission for UNESCO. The UN agency's headquarters is in Paris, but ties between UNESCO and Germany are old. A long time before the Federal Republic of Germany was admitted as a member of the United Nations in 1973, UNESCO opened the door to Germany's return to international politics at a multilateral level. UNESCO in Germany today has several topics of interest within its field of work, including education, science, culture and communication.

The program also focused on Prussian cultural heritage, which includes national museums in Berlin. Berlin's Museum Island is a magnificent work of art - an outstanding ensemble of five world-renowned museums. I advise everyone to go and visit the island. The complex has been named a UNESCO World Heritage Site. After my visit, I know why, and UNESCO is right. From the bust of Egyptian queen Nefertiti, to the breathtaking Pergamon altar and the stunning Ishtar Gate, the museums have it all.

Germany has a policy to protect its history and cultural heritage. In Germany, cultural sites are endless and always wooing the public. There are calls for promoting private initiatives like the German Heritage Foundation, which seeks to create awareness among the society's members. Another example is the Zollverein Coal Mine Industrial Complex in Essen. It is a place not to miss. It was the world's largest and most modern coalmining facility and a leading example of the development of heavy industry in Europe. Today, with its Bauhaus-influenced design, the mine is a triumph of modern industrial architecture and a center of art and culture.

Cologne Cathedral is a breathtaking site restored by experts. The place was packed with people from around the world and is surrounded with touristic shops. The Augustusburg and Falkenlust palaces form a historical building complex in Bruhl, North Rhine, and are amazing. The palaces were built at the beginning of the 18th century and are listed as UNESCO world heritage sites since 1984. They are proof that "anything made by man bears the mark of his time and place and once lost, it is gone forever".

The participants of the program were all highly experienced, contributing to the enrichment of dialogue and diversity, whether geographical or cultural, which contributed to identifying other cultures and not only of the host country. Germany is a country that has survived wars, but does not want to forget its history. Germany today is strong because it knows how to preserve its identity.

### DRIVER'S LICENSES ISSUED **ELECTRONICALLY SOON**

**KUWAIT:** The next few weeks will see the first step of issuing driver's licenses electronically, which aims at making a qualitative move in serving citizens and expats. There will be 15 self-service kiosks to issue driver's licenses, as well as introducing a new generation of smart driver's licenses according to international standards for citizens and upgrading printers that match the latest techniques in this field.

### System upgrade

Acting Director of the Public Authority for Manpower Ahmad Al-Mousa responded to complaints by some users of the electronic system on the delay in transactions for their workers. "The system may be slower due to the improvements that the system is currently undergoing," he said, adding that "this slowness will not last long." Mousa thanked employees at the work departments for their efforts.

### **Exonerated**

The criminal court exonerated managers of three commercial companies as well as 22 citizens over charges of taking illegal salaries from the Manpower and Government Restructuring Program (MGRP) through forgery. The prosecution had accused them of forging official documents between July 8, 2007 till Dec 31, 2011. The documents are applications to register the suspects at the Public Institution for Social Security, and applications to receive social allowance payments from MGRP. The prosecution also accused them of taking thousands of dinars in cash by committing the actions

**KUWAIT:** At least 2,366 people were killed in traffic accidents from 2012 to April, 2017, statistics by Ministry of Interior have revealed. Up to 917,447 accidents took place during this period, the ministry's public relations and security media department said in a press statement on Monday. The number of people killed by traffic accidents in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 reached 454, 445, 461, 429, 424 and 153 respectively, it added. The number of acci-

PEOPLE IN FIVE YEARS IN KUWAIT dents in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017 hit 66,271; 89,527; 99,047; 77,961; 71,582 and 23,529 respectively, it noted. Most traffic accidents and violations were caused by exceeding speed limitations, crossing red signals and talking on mobile phones while driving, the statement pointed out. The statement urged vehicles' drivers to necessarily abide by traffic rules, regulations and signals in order to avoid accidents and keep the safety of people. — KUNA


### BACKUP LOCATION SECURED FOR KEY PETROCHEMICAL PROJECT




### US DOLLAR RATE STABLE AT KD 0.302

### MAN QUESTIONED IN WOMAN'S OD DEATH

**KUWAIT:** Hawally detectives arrested a middle-aged citizen who accompanied a woman who was found dead as a result of a drug overdose. After learning about the discovery of a woman's body in her car, the Interior Ministry's Assistant Undersecretary for Criminal Security Major General Khalid Al-Dayeen, ordered the arrest of the man who investigations revealed was with her and left her in the car. Detectives arrested the suspect who told them he tried to take the woman to Mubarak Hospital, but noticed that she was dead, so kept her in the car and escaped.

### **Assault**

The Indian man drove away, and the citizen could not get his car's plate number. Separately, an Iranian inmate at central prison suffered a broken nose during a fight with a Kuwaiti prisoner. ### Officer assaulted

A citizen was detained in Sulaibiya police station and charged with beating and insulting a public employee, before being released hours later. A security source said a special forces officer was heading to the Palestinian embassy, and there was a car in front of him obstructing traffic so he stopped him, then when he asked him for his ID, the man said "you are not a traffic officer," and attacked him.

### **Nude video**

Criminal detectives arrested a woman who posed nude on Snapchat, prompting wide complaints from the app users in Kuwait. Police were able to identify the woman after her footage went viral on the internet, then arrested her for questioning.

### Hoax call

A security source said that 112 emergency number received a call from a person who asked for an ambulance, and once he was transferred to the ambulance operator, he said "there is a dead mouse outside," and there were people laughing in the background. The caller posted a video clip on social media documenting the incident. Detectives are working on identifying the suspects to arrest them.

### **Suicide investigation**

The body of an Indian farm guard in Kabd was sent to the coroner as he hanged himself there. The farm's owner called police and told them that he found the guard hanging from the ceiling. A suicide case was lodged at the police station.

### Bootlegger arrested

A restaurant delivery man, was found delivering liquor to his customers before being arrested with possession of 81 bottles ready for sale. The arrest was made when police stopped the man's car for a traffic violation, but detected the scent of liquor coming from the car. They searched the car and found liquor in plastic bags. ### FORGED ACADEMIC **DEGREES SCANDAL**

ew are those who were not angry or ashamed ■ towards what I mentioned in a previous column about the ethical scandal related to the forged academic degrees. The scandal of academic degrees at all levels is not new, as thousands had received jobs in the military and other jobs while only having a middle school certificate as their highest academic qualification. Many were promoted with a forged high school degree, and forgery also hit BA, Master's and PhD degrees, particularly in the education and training sectors.

I learnt about the problem like others in the 1960s, when we used to see those who never left Kuwait and were not known for their genius receiving PhD degrees, especially from Egypt, including a former undersecretary and some educators along with others who did not harm anyone because they worked in the private sector.

We all remember, until recently, that some 'dignitaries' and MPs meeting with senior state officials, and taking pictures with them on the occasion of receiving postgraduate degrees. Most of them did know how to pronounce the name of the university from which they bought the degree! We, of course, cannot forget the scandal that was uncovered by the New York Times in May 2015, which I previously wrote about, involving a Pakistani company convicted for selling thousands of university degrees including Master's and PhDs in the name of prestigious American universities and has stamp approvals of university presidents and officials, including the US Secretary of State John Kerry. The company gained huge amounts of money out of that; especially from nationals in Africa, Asia, and the Arabian Gulf in particular, and the names of many of them were published then. However, I do not remember that the education ministry made a move towards that.

It was nice for the National Assembly to ask for the education and higher education minister to hold all those proven to forge their certificates to account; but we all know that proving such charges is a highly complicated process and requires a very long time to accomplish. This is enough for all to forget the issue after being pre-occupied with other scandals. The matter may end with the conviction of several persons, and strict action will be taken against them.

The issue is really complicated, as in addition to the high numbers, and having names of 'dignitaries' in sensitive posts, there are those who studied and received their degrees, but from unrecognized universities, that apart from those who received their degrees from known universities, but those were forged, besides those who received them from nonexistent universities to start with.

A trusted friend of mine told me that our embassy in Washington proposed to the ministry of education to withdraw some students from non-recognized American universities and make them join better universities and extend their scholarships to makeup for the lost period. Because of the harm the country will receive in the future, the students remain in uch bad universities, yet the education ministry rejected the interference of the foreign ministry in educational matters. The number of those students was few at the time, but staying silent multiplied the number much further. Finally, it is ironic that Kuwait is the only country around the world that has a society for PhD forgers, which was formed to lobby the government into recognizing their certificates.

### TRUMP RENEWS ATTACKS ON ATTORNEY GENERAL

### BIZARRE SPEECH TO BOY SCOUTS LEAVES ORGANIZATION CONFUSED

**WASHINGTON:** US President Donald Trump resumed his attacks on Attorney General Jeff Sessions yesterday, calling his onetime ally "VERY weak" in pursuing intelligence leaks and for failing to go after former Democratic presidential candidate Hillary Clinton over her email. Trump's latest Twitter salvo followed a report in the Washington Post that the president and his advisers have discussed replacing Sessions, one

of the Republican billionaire's earliest supporters. "Attorney General Jeff Sessions has taken a VERY weak position on Hillary Clinton crimes (where are E-mails &DNC server) & Intel leakers!" Trump tweeted. Trump has openly criticized Sessions for recusing himself from overseeing a federal probe into possible collusion between the Trump campaign and Russia to meddle in the 2016 US presidential elections. Sessions has said he has no plans to resign.

With pressure mounting from the investigation led by former FBI director Robert Mueller, Trump has sought to revive an election year controversy over Clinton's use of a private server to send email while secretary of state. The White House also alleged last week that the Democrats colluded with Ukraine during the 2016 campaign, adding another twist to the president's counter-offensive. "Ukrainian efforts to sabotage Trump campaign - 'quietly working to boost Clinton.' So

where is the investigation AG," Trump said in another early morning tweet yesterday.

### 'Beleaguered'

US presidents normally go to great pains to avoid being seen as influencing ongoing or possible investigations, making Trump's attacks on Sessions all the more extraordinary. On Monday, Trump took to Twitter to declare his top law enforcement official "beleaguered" as he wondered out loud why Sessions was not investigating Clinton. "So why aren't the Committees and investigators, and of course our beleaguered A.G., looking into Crooked Hillarys crimes & Russia relations?"Trump asked.

Trump has expressed increasing anger with Sessions as his Justice Department's investigations into possible Trump-Russia collusion has quickened. Last week, he publicly upbraided Sessions for stepping back from issues related to the probe. Sessions recused himself because of his role on Trump's campaign and because he failed to tell the Senate during his confirmation hearings about contacts he had with the Russian ambassador in Washington. Trump said he would never have hired Sessions had he known he would recuse himself. "I think is very unfair to the president," Trump told The New York Times last week. "It's extremely unfair, and that's a mild word, to the president."

### Widening probe

Trump's eldest son, son-in-law and top aides have become entangled in the widening investigation led by Mueller. Jared Kushner, the president's son-in-law and a top White House official. was questioned Monday by a Senate panel about contacts with then Russian ambassador Sergey Kislyak, a Russian financier and a Russian lawyer who offered dirt on Clinton.

Kushner made a statement denying collusion after testifying behind closed doors, insisting the string of undisclosed meetings with Russian officials were "proper." "Jared Kushner did very well yesterday in proving he did not collude with the Russians. Witch Hunt. Next up, 11 year old Barron Trump!" Trump tweeted yesterday. In May, Trump fired FBI director James Comey over the bureau's investigation into Russia. That led to Mueller's appointment as a special prosecutor.

The Post report said Trump associates see getting rid of Sessions as part of a potential strategy to fire Mueller and end the Russia investigation. The website Axios reported that Trump was considering replacing Sessions with another early supporter, Rudy Giuliani, a former New York mayor. But Giuliani dismissed the report and said Sessions was right to have recused himself from the Russia probe, CNN reported. Sessions "made the right decision under the rules of the Justice Department," CNN quoted Giuliani as saying as he arrived at Ronald Reagan Washington National Airport.

### Boy Scouts gets taste of Washington politics

Elsewhere, after another challenging day in Washington, President Donald Trump flew to West Virginia to a field full of 40,000 chanting and cheering Boy Scouts, telling them he was happy to leave Washington behind. "Who the hell wants to speak about politics?" Trump boomed, telling the boys he wanted to talk about how to achieve their dreams.

But politics proved too hard for Trump to resist on a day he spent pleading for Republican senators to vote to advance his long-promised health care overhaul and watching his son-in-law Jared Kushner being grilled on Capitol Hill about contacts with Russia. It did not take long for Trump to veer from inspiration to denigration. The teenaged boys loved it, cheering wildly at each sick burn, hooting and hollering like they were at a wrestling match.

"Tonight we put aside all of the policy fights in Washington, DC you've been hearing about with the fake news and all of that," he told the teenaged boys, sitting state by state in brightly colored t-shirts. "You know, I go to Washington and I see all these politicians and I see the swamp and it's not a good place," said Trump.

"In fact, today I said we ought to change it

from the word 'swamp' to the word 'cesspool' or perhaps to the word 'sewer.' It's not good. I see what's going on and believe me, I'd much rather be with you, that I can tell you," Trump said. He told the boys that the media were dishonest and would not show the size of their jamboree on television. "Fake media, fake media," Trump said, eliciting a chorus of boos and cheers.

Trump recounted his election night victories, state by state, the boys from Wisconsin cheering when they heard their state mentioned, the boys from Michigan doing the same. But the most sustained round of cheers and jeers came when Trump mentioned his predecessor President Barack Obama, who had declined invitations to speak to the scout gathering while he was in office.

"By the way, just a question: did President Obama ever come to a jamboree?" Trump said. Trump said he has 10 former Boy Scouts serving in his cabinet and White House, and brought a few on stage as examples of Boy Scout leadership in action, including Tom Price, his health secretary. "Hopefully he's going to get the votes tomorrow to start our path toward killing this horrible thing known as Obamacare," Trump said, referring to Obama's signature health care legislation, as the boys booed. "He better get them, otherwise I'll say, 'Tom, you're fired!" he said, borrowing the catch phrase from his reality television show, "The Apprentice."—Agencies

### BUILDING COLLAPSE KILLS 6 IN MUMBAI

MUMBAI: At least six people were crushed to death when a four-storey building collapsed in India's financial capital of Mumbai yesterday, the latest incident to highlight poor construction standards in the country. Rescuers pulled a dozen others out of the rubble alive, some seriously injured, after the structure gave way mid-morning in the northern suburb of Ghatkopar, officials said.

"The death toll is now six. We think around 15 may still be trapped and rescue operations are ongoing," Tanaji Kamble, a disaster management spokesman for Mumbai's civic administrative body, told AFP. Building collapses are common in India, especially during the annual monsoon season which usually runs from late June to September.

In a separate incident yesterday, a building partially collapsed in Kolkata in India's east after days of monsoonal rain. Several people were trapped in the rubble, but there were no immediate reports of casualties. "Firefighters are trying to rescue the people trapped under the debris," said G P Ghosh, director of fire services in West Bengal state. Mumbai is particularly susceptible with millions forced to live in cramped, ramshackle properties because of rising real estate prices and a lack of housing for the poor.

The city has been hit by several deadly building collapses in recent years, often caused by shoddy construction, poor quality materials or ageing buildings. In 2013, 60 people were killed when a residential block came crashing down in one of Mumbai's worst housing disasters. A dilapidated building left 12 people dead when it collapsed near the city in August 2015. Nine people died the same month when another old three-storey building collapsed in monsoon rain in the Mumbai suburb of Thakurli.

### 8 dead in worsening floods Meanwhile worsening floods killed another eight peo-

ple in 24 hours in India's Gujarat state as rescue teams raced yesterday to reach hundreds of people marooned in stricken towns and villages. With scores now dead in monsoon floods across the country, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was to fly over Gujarat later yesterday to inspect the devastation, officials said.

More than 36,000 people have been moved to safe areas and helicopters and boats were used to rescue the worst-hit. Torrential rain and the release of water from dams in neighboring Rajasthan state created havoc in northern Gujarat, a government statement said. Army and air force helicopter rescue teams picked up more than 1,000 people from villages in the state cut off by rising water levels, it added.

About 80 people are believed to have been killed in Gujarat since the start of the monsoon a month ago, and scores elsewhere in the country. Gujarat's main city Ahmedabad has had more than 50 centimeters of rain in four days, twice the average for July. Downpours have wreaked havoc in several parts of the country.

Apart from Gujarat, Arunachal Pradesh and Assam states in India's northeast have been hard-hit, while pockets of the eastern states of Odisha and Bihar have also been affected. In Assam at least 75 people have been killed and a state-wide emergency relief operation has been underway since April. Tens of thousands of acres of crops have been destroyed. Thirteen people were killed in flash floods in Jammu and Kashmir at the weekend. —Agencies

### COURT BATTLE OVER UK BABY RAISES ETHICAL CONUNDRUM

**LONDON:** A five-month legal battle over the fate of a terminally-ill British baby that drew the attention of Pope Francis and US President Donald Trump has also stoked an often angry debate about medical ethics and the courts. Charlie Gard's parents waged a high-profile campaign with the help of social media and Britain's tabloids for him to receive experimental treatment in the United States, striking a chord worldwide.

They are now spending the last few days with their 11-month-old son before life support is withdrawn at a hospital in London after acknowledging in court on Monday that therapy could no longer help him. "Noone wanted this outcome. No-one believes this outcome was in Charlie's best interests," said Julian Savulescu, director of the Uehiro Centre for Practical Ethics at the University of Oxford. "There has got to be a better way." Charlie was born on August 4 last year

with a rare form of mitochondrial disease that causes progressive muscle weakness in the heart and other key organs and is only able to survive with life support. His parents raised money to take their baby to the United States through crowdfunding but were prevented from doing so by the hospital and first went to court in March to try and overturn that decision. Their appeals went all the way to the Supreme Court but were turned down at all stages of the judicial process and judges at the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg refused to intervene.

### Who should decide?

Charlie was due to be taken off life support before the Vatican intervened on July 2 with a statement in which Pope Francis expressed his support for the parents and said he hoped doctors would allow them to "care for their

the following day, saying in a tweet that he would be "delighted" to help.

A Vatican-run hospital in Rome and a US hospital then offered to treat Charlie and London's Great Ormond Street Hospital went to court to seek a ruling on whether to allow him to undergo experimental therapy. There have also been small protests by supporters of Charlie's parents-a group calling itself "Charlie's Army"-outside Buckingham Palace and Downing Street calling for the hospital to listen to the parents. Savulescu said social media had given greater power to parents to make their case heard.

The question of who should decide is legitimate. Some people have wrongly concluded that these decisions should only be up to parents. "But at the same time it is right that doctors, scientific experts and the courts should not be considered almighty,

"The problem is not who has the power, it is how it is used and the need for robust, and humble, ethical deliberation," he added.

Charlie's case is far from the only medical ethics case to end up in court in Britain and elsewhere. In France, the case of a man who was left severely brain damaged and quadriplegic as a result of a 2008 road accident has been in the courts since 2014. Family members of Vincent Lambert are divided on whether to withdraw life support.

### **Role for mediation**

Dominic Wilkinson, a consultant neonatologist and professor of medical ethics at Oxford University said court reviews in cases like Charlie Gard's was "not ideal". "It is adversarial, costly and lengthy," he said. "We need to find better ways to avoid cases of disagreement from coming to court. There is an important role for mediation to help parents and doctors where they have reached an impasse."

But Ian Kennedy, emeritus professor at University College London said the courts must be respected. "Parents cannot always be the ultimate arbiters of their children's interests," he wrote in The Guardian. "We are not in the realm of there being a right answer. We are in the realm of judgment, reasoned judgment, and we look to the courts to provide this." Kennedy warned that campaigns against the courts were "increasingly a feature of modern discourse". "It is one thing to comment on or criticize a particular decision. It is a very different thing to attack the institution of the courts." — AFP

### MAN SHOUTING 'ALLAHU AKBAR' IN SPAIN BORDER KNIFE ATTACK

**MADRID:** A knife-wielding man shouting "Allahu Akbar" entered the border post between Morocco and the Spanish territory of Melilla yesterday, threatening police who wrestled him to the ground. The man is in custody, Spanish Interior Minister Juan Ignacio Zoido tweeted, without indicating whether the incident was an attempted terror attack.

Zoido posted security camera footage of the drama-which took place on Spanish soil-showing the man in a blue top walking slowly through the border post holding a knife, police closing in on him. One of the officers hurled a portable road barricade at him, throwing him to the ground as other agents pounced to remove the knife.

"A man entered the border post and once inside, pulled out a large knife and confronted (police) shouting 'Allahu Akbar' (God is Greater), slightly injuring a policeman," Irene Flores, spokeswoman for the central government's representative office in Melilla, told AFP. Flores said an initial investigation indicated the man was Moroccan, but this has yet to be confirmed. A police spokesman had earlier said the man ran into the border post, but that is not visible on the footage.

### **Restive border**


Melilla and its sister Spanish city Ceuta, both Spanish territories on Morocco's northern coast, are the only two land borders between Africa and the European Union. Many Moroccans live there or go there daily to buy tax-free products. They are also a strong draw for migrants desperate to reach Europe, many of them from sub-Saharan Africa.

These regularly storm the border fences or try and smuggle themselves in. The Melilla border has been hit by three carramming incidents this year, with people driving vehicles with migrants hidden inside into the border post at high speed. But this is believed to be the first incident of this type. Spain has so far been spared the kind of extremist violence that has occurred in nearby France, Belgium and Germany. But it was hit by what is still Europe's deadliest jihadist attack in March 2004, when bombs exploded on commuter trains in Madrid, killing 191 people in an attack claimed by Al Qaeda-inspired extremists. Since 2016, Spain has emerged as a potential target for jihadists, with extremist websites mentioning it for historical reasons, since much of its territory was once under Muslim rule.

### Third tourism destination

Generally, authorities in Spain-the world's third largest tourism destinationremain discreet on the terror threat. But they publicize every arrest of alleged jihadists, most of them detained for propaganda, recruitment for extremist groups or "glorifying terrorism." According to the interior ministry, more than 180 "jihadist terrorists" have been arrested since June 2015 when Spain raised the terror alert level to four out of a maximum of five, in domestic and foreign operations.

In Ceuta and Melilla, where poverty and unemployment are rife, such arrests are frequent. The last in Melilla dates back to June 23 when a man suspected of having tried to recruit fighters for the Islamic State group (IS) was detained. "Radicalization in Spain isn't uniform over all the national territory but appears to be concentrated around clusters or pockets of radicalization," said Clara Garcia Calvo from the Real Instituto Elcano think tank, who researches global extremism. She told AFP that these "clusters" were in Madrid, Barcelona, Ceuta and Melilla. — AFP

### VENEZUELA OPPOSITION **URGES BOYCOTT OF VOTE TO** OVERHAUL CONSTITUTION

**CARACAS:** Venezuela's angry opposition is pushing for a boycott of an upcoming vote that it dismisses as a ploy by President Nicolas Maduro to cling to power. Ahead of next Sunday's election for a 500-plus member assembly to rewrite the constitution and give the president more power, the opposition also plans a general strike-the second in weeks-on Wednesday and

Thursday and a big protest march on Friday. It all makes for a dramatic week in the opposition's dogged drive to unseat the socialist Maduro, whom it blames for an acute economic crisis marked by shortages of food, medicine and such basics as diapers, soap and toilet paper. Four months of almost daily street protests in the oil-rich OPEC member have left 103 people dead.

"Let them lock us all up. The fight must move forward," said Freddy Guevara, the deputy speaker of the opposition-controlled congress. "The people of Venezuela must fuel the general strike. They must come to Caracas and help us prepare for the civic boycott," Guevara told a news conference. He insisted his supporters will not resort to violence.

Leopoldo Lopez, an opposition leader moved to house arrest from prison earlier this month, met Monday with former Spanish Prime Minister Jose Luis Rodriguez Zapatero, and warned him of the grave potential for conflict if Maduro installs a Constituent Assembly, Guevara said later on his Twitter account. "The demand of the people was communicated to Zapatero: that the Constituent Assembly be withdrawn and that the decision of the people

be respected," he said, referring to an opposition-organized referendum July 16 that massively rejected Maduro's plans.

Next Sunday's vote is supposed to be for a 545-seat constituent assembly that will draw its members not from political parties but rather social sectors which the opposition sees as loyal to Maduro, a former bus driver who was the handpicked successor of late socialist firebrand Hugo Chavez. Maduro on Sunday urged the opposition to refrain from violence, respect the voting and let those who wish to cast ballots do so.

"I demand this of all the opposition leaders," Maduro said on state TV. "The US right wing thinks it can give orders in Venezuela, but the only one who gives orders in Venezuela is the people," Maduro said on his television show. Maduro's comments Sunday followed a warning the president had issued the previous night about the vote, and how the opposition behaves next weekend. "We will be relentless if they try to generate a process of violence in order to stop that which cannot be stopped," he said.

### 'Treason'

Also during his Sunday TV program, Maduro said that 33 judges whom the opposition-controlled congress designated Friday as a sort of shadow Supreme Court would be arrested. One of them had already been detained Saturday. The opposition says the current top court is packed with hardcore Maduro loyalists. Many of its justices were hastily appointed shortly before Maduro's ruling party lost its majority in congress in 2015 legislative elections. — AFP

### RIVAL LIBYA LEADERS 'COMMIT TO CEASEFIRE, ELECTIONS' AT TALKS

### ONLY A POLITICAL SOLUTION CAN END THE CRISIS

**PARIS:** The two main rivals in conflict-ridden Libya are committed to a ceasefire and holding elections "as soon as possible", according to a draft statement released ahead of French-brokered talks yesterday. The communique says Libya's UN-backed Prime Minister Fayez Al-Sarraj and Khalifa Haftar, the military commander who controls the remote east of the vast country, accept that only a political solution can end the crisis.

Diplomatic sources said the two sides had agreed on a joint statement but that the text being circulated was not the final version. The 10-point version seen by AFP says the ceasefire would not apply to counter-terrorism efforts. It also says the two sides are committed to developing the rule of law. French President Emmanuel Macron, who has made Libya one of his foreign policy priorities, has organized the meeting and while officials admit they have modest expectations, they say it sends a "strong signal".

French officials are aiming to persuade the two sides to agree on a roadmap to end a conflict that has plunged the oil-rich country into chaos since the 2011 uprising that toppled longtime dictator Moamer Kadhafi. The newly appointed UN envoy for Libya, Ghassam Salame, was to chair the talks, but Macron was to make a statement at the end. It is the second time that Sarraj and Haftar have met in the space of three months after they held talks in Abu Dhabi in May. That meeting made little progress.

### **Battle for control**

Dozens of armed groups have vied for control in Libya in the power vacuum created by Kadhafi's fall Sarrai's Government of National Accord (GNA) has sought to unify powerful factions, but despite support from the United Nations has struggled to assert its authority since it began work in Tripoli in March 2016. A rival administration based in Libya's remote east-with which Haftar is allied-refuses to recognise Sarraj's government.

Jihadist groups have profited from the turmoil, seizing the Mediterranean coastal city of Benghazi three years ago, although Haftar's forces drove the extremists out earlier this month. Another diplomatic source involved in the talks said there was skepticism about whether the military strongman was prepared to share power.

"We have to hope that when he signs something, he will keep his word," the source said, speaking on condition of anonymity. Human Rights Watch said it was watching the talks closely after a video appeared on social media this week showing the execution of 20 blindfolded people in orange jumpsuits, reportedly by members of the self-styled Libyan National Army (LNA) commanded by Haftar.

Eric Goldstein, Middle East and North Africa deputy director for Human Rights Watch said, if confirmed, the executions were "yet another manifestation of how (the LNA's members) are taking the law into their own hands in the absence of accountability and rule of law". The rights group called for those accused to be removed from active duty and held accountable if found guilty.

Human traffickers have exploited the chaos in Libva to boost their lucrative but deadly trade, and the country has this year become the main springboard for migrants seeking to reach Europe in often flimsy and overloaded boats. Since January, more than 100,000 migrants have made the perilous voyage from Libya, with 85,000 arriving on the shores of Italy, according to the International Organization for Migration. About 2,360 people have drowned this year attempting to make the journey, the IOM says. — AFP

# AL-QAEDA IN SYRIA CLOSE TO SNUFFING OUT COMPETITION

**BEIRUT:** Syrian rebels and activists are warning that an Al-Qaeda-linked jihadi group is on the verge of snuffing out what remains of the country's uprising in northwestern Syria, after the extremists seized control of the opposition-held regional capital, Idlib, last weekend. With the jihadis cementing their authority over the city and its province, also called Idlib, Syrian President Bashar Assad has been supplied with a useful pretext for a long-expected assault against the rebellious province: that the uprising against him is largely driven by Islamists and terrorists.

"There is the real possibility that because of the Nusra Front's domination, the regime will enter the area with international approval," said Lt Col Fares Bayoush, a longtime opponent of Assad, who has been leading a rebel faction in north Syria. The Nusra Front is one of the many names for the al-Qaida-affiliate that now heads the mighty Hay'at Tahrir al Sham militant group - Arabic for Levant Liberation Committee - that seized the city of Idlib, as well as two border crossings with Turkey to feed its coffers. It is also known as HTS.

In July last year, the Nusra Front changed its name to Fatah al-Sham Front and said it was cutting all its links with al-Qaida, a move seen by many as an attempt to improve its image and market itself as a faction defending the Syrian people. It abides by a deeply conservative code for ethics and jurisprudence and tolerates no dissent - leading many who live under its rule to complain they are no better than the government they sought to overthrow in 2011.

### **Black flags** The fresh gains by HTS in northern Syria come at

a time when the Islamic State group is suffering defeats at the hands of Iraqi and Syrian forces as well as US-backed Kurdish-led fighters in northern Syria. In Idlib demonstrations last week, the group's members shot at protesters waving the tri-color flag of the Syrian uprising. HTS will only accept their own, jihadi-inspired black flags to be flown in their presence. "Any party that tries to confront HTS will be crushed," said an activist based in northwest Syria.

"This is a big blow for the Syrian revolution. Bashar will look like he is fighting terrorism," the activist said, speaking on condition of anonymity for fear of reprisals by the HTS. With its previous incarnations, Hay'at Tahrir al Sham has long been the top dog in Idlib province but the putsch has had the effect of making it feel official. In recent weeks, the group deployed masked gunmen and carried out raids in search operations for alleged IS members.

HTS deployed across Idlib city last weekend after a rival faction, the ultraconservative Ahrar al-Sham group, withdrew. Five days of clashes around the province left 77 fighters and 15 civilians dead, according to the Britain-based Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitoring group.

Other factions, including many once financed and armed in part by the CIA, kept to the sidelines. They are hoping to win a share of the revenues from the lucrative Bab Al-Hawa border crossing, said a Turkey-based opposition activist who liaises with Syrian rebels and their state sponsors. He asked for anonymity so as not to jeopardize his position. That crossing used to bring Ahrar al-Sham over \$1 million in revenues a month, according to a senior Ahrar al-Sham official, who also asked for anonymity for the same reason. The group will now have to share those revenues with HTS after forfeiting its monopoly over it to a "civilian administration" forced in by the extremists. HTS also seized Sarmada - the first town after the Bab Al-Hawa crossing and an important trade hub in north Idlib - and Khirbet Al-Jouz, home to a second, less important crossing with Turkey. "Ahrar Al-Sham no longer has a real on-the-ground presence in Idlib province. It's over," said the Observatory's chief, Rami Abdurrahman. HTS and Ahrar have long been at odds over Idlib, but the rout last week nevertheless carried a hint of betrayal, as the two sides fought side by side in 2015 to throw the government out of the province once and for all. — AP

### DRIVER CHARGED AS DEATH TOLL CLIMBS AMONG TRUCK MIGRANTS

which 10 migrants suffocated to death has told how travelers took turns breathing through a tiny hole in a desperate bid to stay alive, US investigators said Monday. As charges were filed against the driver who was detained in Texas near the border with Mexico, one of President Donald Trump's cabinet secretaries denounced the "brutality" of people-

And two children were among a group of more than two dozen people still in hospital, suffering from heat stroke and dehydration, after an ordeal which ended in a parking lot. The migrants were discovered in the back of the 18-wheel truck in the early hours of Sunday in San Antonio, Texas, a two-hour drive from the US-Mexico border, when one of them approached a Walmart store employee asking for water.

The employee brought water and then called police, who found 38 people crammed in the trailer with a broken refrigeration system, parked in the baking Texas heat. Eight people were pronounced dead at the scene and two others died later at the

**CHICAGO:** A survivor of a horror truck journey in hospital. The sweltering trailer may have held between 70 to 200 people, with some migrants fleeing in six SUVs that had been waiting when the truck stopped in the parking lot, according to witness accounts given to authorities.

### 'Driver never stopped'

The document recounted a harrowing journey, with migrants having trouble breathing and some passing out in the trailer which was being driven by James Mathew Bradley Jr, age 60. "People began hitting the trailer walls and making noise to get the driver's attention. The driver never stopped," according to one of the migrants interviewed, identified only as JMM-J. "People had a hole in the trailer wall to provide some ventilation and they started taking turns breathing from the hole."

JMM-J said he was a Mexican national and part of a group of 29 people being smuggled into the United States. He said that after crossing the border they joined 70 migrants already in the truck's trailer. US authorities have not released all the vic-

tims' nationalities or names, pending notification of their families. Mexico's foreign ministry said four of the dead were Mexican, out of a total of 25 Mexicans riding on the truck. The other 21 remain hospitalized.

The Guatemalan foreign ministry said 20-yearold Frank Fuentes was among those killed, and his family had already been contacted to begin the process of repatriating his body. Two other Guatemalans, one of them a minor, were hospitalized and in stable condition, the ministry said. According to the migrant's recollection, his smuggler said "people linked to the Zetas" crime cartel were offering protection for the journey through Mexico to the US border, and that once arriving in the country he was to pay \$5,500.

The driver was formally charged on Monday with one count of transporting illegal aliens. The federal charge against Bradley is punishable by life imprisonment or even theoretically the death penalty. Bradley has told police he did not know he was transporting people until he stopped at the

Walmart store to use the restroom and observed "banging and shaking," prosecutors said.

### 'Network of death'

Bradley said he was delivering the trailer from Iowa to Texas on the orders of his boss, and attempted to administer aid when he found the migrants, but did not call 911, according to the complaint. Thirty people were hospitalized-including two school-age children-and more than a dozen were in critical condition, suffering from heat stroke and dehydration, authorities said. It was unclear how long the migrants were inside the truck.

Homeland Security Secretary John Kelly in a statement called the deaths "senseless" and the result of a human trafficking "network of abuse and death." "This tragedy demonstrates the brutality of the network of which I often speak. These smugglers have no regard for human life and seek only profits," Kelly said. Kelly has been to Mexico twice to discuss immigration, human trafficking and the sprawling cross-border drug trade. — AFP

### PAKISTAN VICTIMS CALL FOR ATTACK PLOTTERS TO HANG

### 'Uproot these terrorists fully so our country can progress

**LAHORE:** Anger was growing in Pakistan yesterday as the grief-stricken relatives of 26 people killed by a suicide bomber in Lahore a day earlier buried their loved ones and demanded the government publicly hang the masterminds of the attack. Families and residents in the bustling eastern city demanded action as they attended funeral prayers, and as the chief minister of Punjab province Shahbaz Sharifbrother of Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif-visited survivors in hospital.

"We demand from the Government of Pakistan that those who are involved in this incident and those who are the facilitators should be hanged in public," Hafiz Naseer ul Din, uncle of a policeman killed in the blast, told AFP. "We came here in great grief," added Shaikh Rizwan, a local resident who attended the funeral prayers for some of the victims. "Twenty-six people were martyred here yesterday, I request my government to please uproot these terrorists fully so our country can progress," he said.

The powerful blast Monday hit a busy vegetable market on a bustling main road in the southern part of Lahore, blowing out the windows in nearby buildings. Many of those killed in the attack were police who were clearing shopping stalls that had illegally encroached on to the road. Yesterday distraught relatives carried the coffins of two policemen, brothers who were killed in the attack, to a petrol pump which had been turned into a makeshift prayer ground.

Floral wreaths from local police chiefs were placed on the wooden coffins as family members wept. Police have said their initial investigations show the attack, claimed by the Pakistani Taleban, was carried out by a suicide bomber. Forensic experts were collecting evidence from the site of the blast Tuesday, an AFP video

Lahore has been hit by significant militant attacks in Pakistan's more than decade-long war on extremism, but they have been less frequent in recent years. The last major blast in the city was in March last year, when 75 were killed and hundreds injured in a bomb targeting Christians celebrating Easter Sunday in a park. But the country was also hit by a wave of attacks in February this year, including a bomb that killed

In April a further seven were killed in an attack in the city targeting a team that was carrying out the country's long overdue census. After years of spiralling insecurity, the powerful army launched a crackdown on militancy in the wake of a brutal attack on a school in late 2014. More than 150 people, most of them children, died in the Taleban-led assault in the northwestern city of Peshawar-the country's deadliest ever single attack.

It shook a country already grimly accustomed to atrocities and prompted the military to step up operations in the tribal areas, where militants had previously operated with impunity. The country has seen a dramatic improvement in security since, though groups such as the Pakistani Taleban retain the ability to carry out

### FRANCE BATTLES RAGING FIRES ON COTE D'AZUR

MARSEILLE: Thousands of firefighters battled forest fires in large areas of southeast France yesterday, with one "extremely virulent" inferno raging near the jetset resort of Saint-Tropez, emergency services said. The blazes have consumed 3,000 hectares of land along the Mediterranean coast, in the mountainous hinterland and on the island of Corsica — at the height of the region's

holiday season. Over 2,000 firefighters and 19 aircraft, including 10 Canadair water bombers, have been mobilized to quench the flames. With strong winds and tinder dry conditions spelling danger for a second day, the government has asked its European Union partners to send two extra air tankers. A fire in La Croix-Valmer near Saint-Tropez, a favorite resort with the rich and famous, was still "extremely virulent and difficult to control," the regional head of security Stephane Bouillon told Europe 1 radio yes-

terday morning. The blaze had already gutted 400 hectares of coastal forest in an area dotted with homes, he said. In Corsica, scores of firefighters worked through the night to tamp down a wall of flames that threatened homes in the town of Biguglia in the northeast. The blaze, which consumed 1,500 hectares of forest, engulfed a sawmill

and burned several vehicles. "It's the apocalypse!" a local resident told AFPTV.

By yesterday morning, the wind had abated and the situation had been brought under control. In the Luberon, an area of hilltop villages and lavender fields in Provence, fires consumed around 800 hectares around the village of Mirabeau and a neighboring hamlet. Around 100 homes had to be evacuated, according to officials, but yesterday firefighters had managed to secure residential areas.

Another blaze in Carros, north of Nice, burned a house, three vehicles and a warehouse and led to some homes being evacuated, according to regional authorities. Speaking to France Info radio, Mayor Charles Scibetta described waking up to a "lunar landscape" and said the inhabitants had had a lucky escape. "All of France is mobilized," the head of the fire service in southeast France, Colonel Gregory Allione told France Info. adding that extra firefighters had been drafted in from the north. Southeast France is experiencing an exceptionally hot, dry summer that have made it especially vulnerable to fires. In mid-July, a blaze believed to have been ignited by a cigarette butt tossed out of a car ripped through 800 hectares of land near Aix-en-

# GREEK JUDGES ACCUSE TSIPRAS GOVERNMENT OF 'DIRTY' ATTACKS

**ATHENS:** Judges in Greece have reacted angrily to a blunt barrage of government criticism over recent court rulings, comparing the "dirty" attacks to authoritarian crackdowns in Turkey and Poland. The government "is systematically attempting to subjugate and control justice," the association of judges and prosecutors protested over the weekend.

July suicide bomb attack. — AFP

"Ministers and lawmakers launch baseless accusations daily... they seek to erode the prestige of the Greek justice system... following the example of Turkey and Poland," they said. "The Greek public can understand the danger posed by a voracious executive, seeking to operate unchecked," the association said. The row erupted after a court earlier this month decided to jail a young graduate student accused of links to one of Greece's most active far-left extremist groups.

The 29-year-old linguist identified only by her first name, Irianna, was handed a 13-year prison sentence in June as a suspected accomplice of the Conspiracy of Fire Nuclei group. Police say they matched her to a partial fingerprint on a gun clip found hidden with other weaponry in an Athens park in 2011. She denies the charges, and her legal team says the alleged fingerprint findings are too partial to be conclusive beyond doubt.

The controversial move to jail her sparked street protests earlier this month, some of them attended by members of Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras' own leftist party Syriza. A number of his ministers and lawmakers have also taken turns attacking justice over the ruling. Among the critics was Justice Minister Stavros Kontonis, who called the decision to deny Irianna release from prison pending appeal an "unpleasant surprise". "It is strange to say the least, when certain people convicted of drug trafficking are allowed release pending trial," Kontonis told parliament last week.

### 'Dark annals'

Government spokesman Dimitris Tzanakopoulos also called the move a "bad development" which would go down in the "dark annals of Greek justice". To calm tempers, the head of Greece's top administrative court, the Council of State, made a rare public address on the issue on Monday. "Judges... do not take instructions (from the government and lawmakers)," said Nikos Sakellariou, adding: "Judges must be politically neutral."

Sakellariou's uncharacteristic public statement, read out to reporters, was carefully timed. It fell on the 43rd anniversary of the

restoration of democracy in Greece following a brutal seven-year army dictatorship. Judges were outraged in October when, on the eve of a key ruling on a private TV tender, a pro-government newspaper reported that one of the Council judges deciding the outcome had had an illicit affair.

"In order to control justice, they have used the dirtiest means available to the state-paidfor journalists," the judges' association said on Sunday. Critics note that Greek justice needs oversight too. A decade ago, a group of judges were given heavy sentences for taking bribes, attempted extortion and abuse of power.

In another case that has riled the government, the Supreme Court prosecutor last week demanded the reopening of an investigation into the former head of Greece's state statistics service, a case Tsipras' administration has been trying to close. Former statistics chief Andreas Georgiou faces charges that he allegedly inflated Greek deficit figures to help international creditors impose harsher terms for a multi-billion-euro bailout in 2010.

One of Greece's foremost legal experts, and a Tsipras ally, President Prokopis Pavlopoulos on Monday appeared to admonish the government. "Man can only live and create in freedom (where) there is a distinction of powers," Pavlopoulos said in an address marking the democracy anniversary. He added that the judiciary had to operate "without interference or bias" and deserved "respect of their independence" from executive and legislative branches.

### 'Dangerous'

Law experts say the open dispute threatens to divide a country already under enormous pressure from a seven-year economic crisis and hardship. "The judges must lower the tone, but the government must also understand its limits," Aristotelio university law professor Grigoris Kalfelis told Athens municipal radio. "This is very dangerous," warned a prosecutor speaking on condition of anonymity.

"It is an institutional attack destabilizing democracy itself," he told AFP, whilst lamenting the escalating row with the judges. "This is paranoia." Turkish judges are among thousands of civil servants targeted in a massive crackdown after a failed putsch against President Recep Tayyip Erdogan last year.— AFP

### TEEN DRIVER LIVESTREAMS CRASH THAT KILLED SISTER

FRESNO: A teenage driver lost control of her car while she was livestreaming on Instagram and recorded part of the crash that authorities said Monday killed her younger sister in California. After a gap in the livestream, the driver is seen leaning over the body of the girl, trying to shake her awake and saying she was sorry. She said she expected to spend the rest of her life in prison but doesn't care.

"This is the last thing I wanted to happen, OK? ... Rest in peace, sweetie," the teen says. "If you don't survive, I'm so (expletive) sorry." Authorities say Obdulia Sanchez, 18, was driving the car Friday when it veered onto the shoulder of a road about 75 miles northwest of Fresno. She overcorrected, causing the vehicle to swerve and overturn into a field, ejecting her sister, the California Highway Patrol said.

Jacqueline Sanchez, 14, of Stockton died in the crash, Merced County Sheriff Vern Warnke said. Another girl, also 14, was in the backseat and survived with a leg injury. The driver was wearing a seatbelt but not the two girls, the CHP said. The teenagers' father, Nicandro Sanchez, told Fresno television station KFSN he has seen the video and that he believes

the crash was "an accident." "It's an accident," Nicandro Sanchez said. "It happened that way. Who knows why?" He said he hasn't spoken to Obdulia but he believes she knowns she did something wrong but doesn't know what happened. "What I think is she knows she's done something wrong. Because she knows, and that's what I feel. She feels bad for herself, but she killed her own sister," he said.

### Difficult childhood

Nicandro Sanchez said Obdulia had a difficult childhood and graduated from high school last year. She was in the custody of Child Protective Services the past two years, he added. Obdulia Sanchez was arrested on suspicion of drunken driving and vehicular manslaughter and remained in jail with bail set at \$300,000. The livestream was recorded on Instagram and posted on Facebook by someone who had seen it. Stockton resident Mary Hernandez said she saw the video there and reposted it.

"People need to know these things can happen," Hernandez said, adding that she had gotten a range of responses from anger to gratitude. "I mean no disrespect to their family for posting it," she said. Hernandez said she knew about Obdulia Sanchez through social media, but they never met in person. Rob Carroll, a chief deputy in the Merced County District Attorney's Office, said he had not yet seen the video. But he expects it will be a key piece of evidence.

"Drinking, driving and driving erratically - obviously those are poor choices," Carroll said. Relatives have set up a GoFundMe page to pay for the funeral of Jacqueline Sanchez. The page says she was planning to celebrate her 15th birthday - known as a quincenera - on Sunday. Her parents, however, told the television station Jacqueline was going to be confirmed in a Catholic church. Neither Obdulia Sanchez nor an attorney representing her could be reached for comment. She is expected to make her first court appearance today. —AP

### MALDIVES TROOPS BLOCKADE PARLIAMENT, CRISIS WORSENS

MALDIVES: Maldivian troops blockaded parliament and clashed with opposition leaders for a second day, witnesses said yesterday, as political turmoil escalated in the troubled honeymoon islands. The latest turbulence came as the United Kingdom urged its citizens to take caution in the capital Male after soldiers tear gassed protesting politicians there. Soldiers barred the main opposition Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) from entering the heavily guarded parliament complex again yesterday, with witnesses reporting shoving as MPs were forced back from the barricade.

"Even when parliament is not in session, MPs are free to go to the building and

attend to their work, but it is not allowed now," MDP spokesman Hamid Abdul Ghafoor told AFP. "This is ridiculous." The parliament gates were padlocked by soldiers Monday in a move described as illegal by exiled Maldivian opposition leader Mohamed Nasheed. An opposition coalition, united against President Abdulla Yameen, had been threatening to move a no-confidence motion against the speaker in a bid to impeach the president's ally. But MPs trying to enter the compound were hit with pepper spray and forcibly evicted.

Yameen's office said in a statement Tuesday that parliament was closed ahead of an "incoming VVIP visit". Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif is in the

Maldives as the tropical island nation celebrates its 52nd anniversary, the Pakistan High Commission in Sri Lanka said. "The special measures taken by the security forces at the parliament building on 24 July 2017 were to ensure the security and safety of the premises, as mandated by the... constitution," Yameen's office said.

### **Political protests**

Residents said security in Male, a congested capital just one-square mile (two square kilometres) in size, was tighter than usual. The UK government urged its citizens to avoid large gatherings and protests following the disturbance around the parliament building. "Previous demonstrations and political protests have led to violence and arrests," the updated travel summary said.

Months of political upheaval in the Maldives has dented its image as a honeymoon paradise. The United States and other nations have urged the Maldives to safeguard democracy amid a crackdown by Yameen on his political opponents, most of whom are in exile or jail. The opposition coalition, led by Nasheed, wants to defeat Yameen at elections next year but is struggling with its leadership in tatters.

Earlier this month they secured enough support from government defectors to begin impeachment proceedings against the speaker, hoping to

weaken Yameen's grip on parliament. However the parliament secretariat declared the impeachment motion was invalid, scheduling the next sitting on July 31. The first attempt to impeach the speaker in March triggered chaos when troops acting on Yameen's orders stormed parliament and removed dissenting opponents by force.

Nasheed became the Maldives' first democratically-elected president in 2008, but was narrowly defeated by Yameen in a controversial 2013 election run-off. In 2015, he was sentenced to 13 years in prison on terrorism charges that were widely seen as politically motivated. He now lives in exile in Britain. —AFP

# N KOREA: 'WE DON'T CARE' ABOUT THE US TRAVEL BAN

### US PASSPORTS WILL NOT BE VALID FOR TRAVEL TO ISOLATED COUNTRY

to North Korea will have no effect on the country's tourism industry and Pyongyang does not care about it "at all", a senior development official insisted yesterday.

The measure is due to be enacted this week and once it goes into force US passports will no longer be valid for travel to the isolated country, which is subject to multiple sets of United Nations sanctions over its nuclear and missile programs. Around 5,000 Western tourists visit the

### 'Risk of arrest'

The State Department has long warned its citizens against travelling to North Korea, telling them they are "at serious risk of arrest and long-term detention under North Korea's system of law enforcement", which "imposes unduly harsh sentences for actions that would not be considered

option on the table. "Certainly, of all the dramas that have gone on lately, the Warmbier issue is the biggest one for tourism," said Simon Cockerell, general manager of market leader Koryo Tours which has seen bookings fall 50 percent. "It's depressed the market quite considerably."

The US decision, he said, would hit North Koreans working in the tourist sector, and wipe out "any possibility of a humanizing human element between those two sides who demonize each other so much". Matt Kulesza, of Young Pioneer Tours-the company which brought Warmbier to the country-said the ban's effect on the North would be "absolutely nothing". But Americans, he added, would lose "the freedom to travel to DPRK (North Korea) and experience the DPRK for themselves".


A promotional video for Han's project takes in beach resorts, the Masikryong skiing centre, and Mount Kumgang, renowned throughout the peninsula for its beauty. It shows the port of Wonsan transformed into a mass of gleaming towers, shopping, entertainment and trade districts, served by multiple transport links including a dual carriageway with four lanes in each direction-a far cry from the bumpy potholed road with unlit tunnels that currently links it to Pyongyang.

Air routes from China, Russia and Japan are also displayed, but no regular international flights have so far been scheduled to Wonsan's newly-built airport. In 2015, said Han's colleague Ri Kyong-Chol, there had been negotiations to start direct flights to Beijing and Shanghai. But "since then, because of political circumstances, the participants of the other side balked". The vast majority of foreign tourists to North Korea are Chinese. Han was unable to put a cost on the scheme. Foreign investment would be welcome, but so far none had been forthcoming due to US sanctions, he said. Hundreds of thousands of South Koreans used to visit Mount Kumgang every year, travelling to a Seoul-funded tourist resort that was the first major inter-Korean cooperation project. But that came to an abrupt end in 2008 when a North Korean soldier shot dead a South Korean tourist who strayed off the approved path and Seoul suspended the trips. New South Korean president Moon Jae-In favors engagement with the North

to bring it to the negotiating table as well as sanctions.

In a five-year plan unveiled last week, his government said it would move to resume tours to Mount Kumgang and re-open the shuttered Kaesong Joint Industrial Zone, where South Korean firms employed tens of thousands of North Korean workers, "when conditions are ripe". But the North's tourism development plan did not factor in visitors from the other side of the divided peninsula, Han said. "We don't need to think of them," he said. "North and South should cooperate among themselves but because of US sanctions, this is not being done. Southern authorities have no intention to do so either." — AFP

North each year, tour companies say, with Americans numbering about 20 percent of them. Standard one-week trips cost about \$2,000. But Han Chol-Su, vice-director of the Wonsan Zone Development Corporation, denied that the loss of business would have any impact.

"If the US government says Americans cannot come to this country, we don't care a bit," he told AFP in Pyongyang. Washington announced the move after the death of Otto Warmbier, the University of Virginia student who was sentenced to 15 years' hard labor in the North for trying to steal a propaganda poster. ### CHINA URGES ASEAN STATES TO REJECT OUTSIDE INTERFERENCE

MANILA: Beijing urged Southeast Asian nations yesterday to unite and "say no" to outside forces seeking to interfere in the South China Sea dispute, in an apparent swipe at the United States ahead of a regional summit. Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi made the statement in Manila where he hailed the "strong momentum" in improving ties with the Philippines, a longstanding American ally which has moved closer to China under President Rodrigo Duterte.

Wang's visit came a week before he was set to return to Manila for a meeting of foreign ministers from the 10member Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and its partners, which include China and the United States. Wang said warming relations between Beijing and Manila had helped ensure stability in the South China Sea, where rival claims have long made it one of Asia's potential military flashpoints. "If there are still some nonregional forces or forces in the region that don't want to see stability in the South China Sea and they still want to stir up trouble in the South China Sea, we need to stand together and say no to them together," Wang told reporters. China claims nearly all of the strategically vital sea, even waters approaching the coasts of its neighbors. ASEAN members the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia and

Brunei, as well as Taiwan, claim parts of the sea. While the United States is not a claimant and says it takes no sides in the disputes, it has criticized what it has termed Chinese "militarization" of the sea. Washington has repeatedly sent warships close to Chinese-occupied islands in the sea in recent years, triggering angry responses from Beijing. Duterte, a self-described socialist, has loosened his nation's 70-year-old alliance with the United States while looking to build stronger relations

with China and Russia. Duterte has downplayed the Philippines' dispute with China, declining to use a favorable ruling from a UNbacked tribunal last year on the issue to pressure Beijing. He has said better relations with China, following six years of tension under his predecessor who took a hard line with Beijing over the dispute, will generate billions of dollars in promised Chinese investments and aid. Duterte said on Monday the Philippines and China were in talks for joint exploration in the sea, which is believed to sit atop vast oil and gas deposits. Wang yesterday pledged 20 million renminbi (\$3 million) to help rehabilitate the war-torn southern Philippine city of Marawi, where a USbacked military offensive is seeking to flush out pro-Islamic State group militants. —AFP

### **Low-caste Hindu leader Kovind** sworn in as India's president

NEW DELHI: Ram Nath Kovind was sworn in as India's president yesterday, becoming just the second leader from the oppressed Dalit community to be elected head of state. A former lawyer and state governor, Kovind was elected to the largely ceremonial position last week with more than 65 percent of the vote by members of India's parliament and state assemblies. Kovind, accompanied by his wife, paid respects early yesterday at a memorial dedicated to India's independence hero Mahatma Gandhi in New Delhi. The 71year-old was nominated by the ruling right-wing Bharatiya Janata Party in a move analysts say would help Modi tighten his grip on power ahead of his re-election bid in 2019.

### At least eight dead in **Indonesian accident**

JAKARTA: At least eight people including a toddler died and two German tourists were among those rescued after a speedboat capsized off the coast of Borneo yesterday. Witnesses described passengers jumping into the water without life vests as the boatcarrying 51 people-capsized outside a busy Indonesian port, while others on board are feared to be trapped inside the boat, rescue officials said. Eight people including a two-year-old child have been found dead, while 22 other people-including a German man and woman-were rescued alive and taken to hospital for treatment, he said.

### India court to consider abortion for rape victim

NEW DELHI: Doctors today will examine a 10-year-old raped by her uncle as India's top court considers whether she should be allowed to have an abortion despite strict laws. The girl's parents went to the Supreme Court after their appeal to abort the 26-week fetus was rejected by a lower authority, despite warnings her body was not ready for childbirth. Indian law does not allow medical terminations after 20 weeks unless there is a threat to the mother's life. But the Supreme Court agreed to hear the appeal, ordering doctors to conduct a medical examination.

### Vietnam activist jailed for 'anti-state' charge

**HANOI:** A Vietnamese activist was jailed for nine years yesterday for "anti-state activity", her lawyer said, the second such heavy sentence handed down by the authoritarian state in less than a month. Dissidents, rights lawyers and bloggers are routinely jailed in the communist country but rights groups and activists accuse the new government in place since last year of waging a particularly harsh crackdown on its critics. Anti-China activist Tran Thi Nga, 40, was sentenced after a one-day trial in a heavily guarded courthouse in northern Ha Nam province, where dozens of supporters gathered outside, some holding signs calling for her release.

### Thai police make huge drug haul linked to Laos suspect

BANGKOK: Thai police yesterday announced the seizure of drugs worth \$30 million, including seven million methamphetamine tablets, "ice" and liquid ketamine, from houses around Bangkok linked to an alleged Laotian drug lord. Nine Thais were arrested in the major two-day operation, which turned up 60 kilograms of crystal methamphetamine-known as "ice"-and thousands of bottles of liquid ketamine. When smoked, "ice" gives a stronger high than the pill version of meth-which is known in Thailand as "yaba" and has also flooded other parts of Southeast Asia.

### **Violence against Afghan** journalists sees surge

KABUL: At least 10 journalists were killed in Afghanistan in the first half of 2017, a 35 percent surge from last year, a media watchdog said yesterday, with rampant violence on the rise in the war-torn country. Taleban militants and the Islamic State group were behind most of the "direct and indirect" attacks on media workers in Afghanistan, the Afghan Journalists' Safety Committee (AJSC) said in a new report. The Afghan government accounted for 46 percent of violence against journalists in the first half of the year, limiting access to information and creating challenging conditions for the media, he added. —Agencies

### **DUTERTE DEMANDS US** RETURN CHURCH BELLS

MANILA: Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte has demanded the United States return church bells seized by American forces in a bloody campaign more than a century ago, in another blast at his country's traditional ally. American forces took three bells from the Catholic church of Balangiga town on the eastern island of Samar in 1901 as war booty in what historians said was a particularly brutal military operation in the new US colony.

"Give us back those Balangiga bells. They are not yours. They are ours. They belong to the Philippines. They are part of our national heritage," Duterte said at his annual State of the Nation Address on Monday. "Those bells are reminders of the gallantry and heroism of our forebears who resisted the American colonisers and sacrificed their lives in the process." Two of the bells are installed at a memorial for US war dead in Wyoming, while the third is with US forces in South Korea.

Some US politicians oppose the dismantling of the memorial. US embassy spokeswoman Molly Koscina gave a non-committal reply yesterday to Duterte's demands. "We are aware that the bells of Balangiga have deep significance for a number of people, both in the United States and in the Philippines," she said in an email to AFP. "We will continue to work with our Filipino partners to find a resolution." The brutal Samar campaign was launched about a month after Filipino rebels killed 34 US troops in Balangiga on September 28, 1901, according to a US Army War College research paper. Seven other American soldiers perished during the escape from Balangiga, and US reinforcements razed the town the day after, it added. Duterte on Monday repeated a Filipino account of the campaign that the commanding general, Jacob Smith, ordered Samar be turned into a "howling wilderness" and that all Filipino males aged 10 or above be killed.

A 1902 US court-martial convicted Smith of a minor offence in relation to the Samar campaign, while 39 other Americans were separately found guilty of torturing and shooting Filipino prisoners there, the US Army War College research paper said. However none of them were jailed, according to the paper. The then Philippine president Fidel Ramos first sought but failed to recover the bells during a 1998 Washington trip.

Duterte, a self-described socialist, has since his election last year worked to distance Manila from Washington while building closer ties with China and Russia. The Philippine islands, a Spanish colony for centuries, were ceded to the United States in 1898 at the end of the Spanish-American War. — AFP

### IRAN'S TECH SECTOR BLOOMS UNDER SHIELD...

Across town, the huge hangars, strip-lighting and shiny booths of the Elecomp tech fair could be anywhere. It is growing rapidly: Its start-up section had 80 hopefuls three years ago, now there are more than 400 - the usual mix of delivery apps, online shopping and games. But global brands are almost entirely absent, the result of severe US sanctions that remain in place despite other countries lifting restrictions under a 2015 nuclear deal.

Some Iranians have found ways to profit from sanctions: One company at Elecomp buys Amazon products from the United States and ships them to Iranians for a small surcharge. "People love it. There are many fake products in Iran. When they order from us, they get the real thing," said its spokesman Hamid Tavakoli. But isolation has been a very mixed blessing. "There are two sides to the coin. When you are under sanctions, you have an opportunity to do many things yourself," said the fair's organizer, Naserali Saadat. "But generally, it's not a good thing... you can't live like an island in this world."

That view is echoed by German-Iranian Ramtin Monazahian, who came from Berlin in 2014 to found ecommerce site Bamilo and taxi-hailing app Snapp. He may not have to worry about Amazon and Uber muscling him

out of the way, but nor can he hope they will buy him up for billions as happens elsewhere. Moreover, he needs a thriving retail sector to underpin his services, and sanctions "hit the consumer area pretty hard. Purchasing power is suffering... that's hurting all businesses," he said. Still, he sees huge potential in a country of 80 million people with a large, consumerist middle-class. "It's probably the last big country with no major competition," he said.

Foreign investors have taken notice. Iran's tech scene has attracted hundreds of millions of dollars from firms such as South Africa's MTN, Germany's Rocket and Swedish company Pomegranate. The real breakthrough is not necessarily the tech itself, said Esfandyar Batmanghelidj, founder of the Europe-Iran Forum, but the forging of these foreign partnerships. "This is not just about digital innovation and young people thinking entrepreneurially - which is somewhat new in Iran - but also how venture capital can influence the bigger picture of investing," he said.

He predicts these partnerships will now be replicated in more traditional sectors like retail. "Tech was a smart place to start-small initial amounts of capital and you're dealing with young entrepreneurs rather than entrenched family owners," said Batmanghelidj. "Of course, many challenges remain, but they were made by people and can be solved by people." — AFP

### SAUDI ARABIA, ALLIES UNVEIL QATAR 'TERRORIST'...

They also demanded that it close broadcasting giant Al-Jazeera and a Turkish military base, and fall in line with Saudi-led policy in the region, particularly towards Iran. Qatar has dismissed the demands as a violation of its sovereignty and has received significant support from its ally Turkey. US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, who last week spent four days in the region trying to broker a settlement of the crisis, has voiced satisfaction with Qatar's efforts to address any suspicion of terror funding.

The four governments yesterday blacklisted three organizations based in Yemen and six based in Libya accusing them of ties to Al-Qaeda. They also blacklisted three Qataris, three Yemenis, two Libyans and a Kuwaiti they said were implicated in "fundraising campaigns to support (former Al-Qaeda affiliate) Al-Nusra Front and other terrorist militias in Syria".

Qatar and its neighbors support opposing sides in the conflict in Libya between a UN-backed unity government in Tripoli and a rival administration in the east. Saudi Arabia has led a military intervention against Shiite rebels in neighboring Yemen since March 2015. Militants of both Al-Qaeda and the Islamic State group have since expanded their presence in areas of the south under the nominal control of the Saudi-backed government.

Meanwhile, Egypt's President Abdel Fattah Al-Sisi said on Monday his government would keep up the blockade of Qatar. "Egypt will stand by its decision and will not backtrack on this matter," Sisi said at a youth conference in Alexandria. "Our persistence on its own, our stance, and this block, is pressure in itself."

Egypt also warned the EU yesterday that four Arab states would accept no compromise in their dispute with Qatar. Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry, speaking after talks with European Union diplomatic chief Federica Mogherini in Brussels, said Qatar must accept in full the demands. "It is not an issue of compromise, we cannot compromise with any form of terrorism, we cannot compromise or enter into any form of negotiations," Shoukry told a press conference.

"It is only once the necessary measures are undertaken by Qatar, that goes towards truly accepting to be a partner in the fight against terrorism, that this crisis will be resolved," he said. Shoukry said Qatar was "harboring elements associated to terrorist ideologies, to radical ideologies, that they have utilized their media outlets to promote and to justify and to glorify terrorist activity."

But the four Arab states face mounting international pressure to compromise in their weeks-old boycott against Qatar, particularly from the United States. Mogherini - who at the weekend met HH the Amir of Kuwait emir, a key figure involved in trying to mediate the crisis - in turn reiterated calls for talks to resolve the crisis. "We in Europe see this as a need not just for one country but for all countries," she said, adding that the EU shared with Egypt a "clear commitment to fight terrorism".

But she added that the EU believed the Kuwaitimediated talks "can and should start as a matter of urgency," if only to head off fresh tensions which undermine the fight against terrorism, she said. "The EU will continue to have good relations with all the countries involved," the former Italian foreign minister added. — Agencies

And mothers in Pittsburgh have started making and selling hijabs for Barbies in a bid to make play more inclusive. However, Khatahtbeh warned of the potential for the young Muslim market to be exploited just for profit without any effort to promote acceptance and integration.

"It can easily become exploitative by profiting off of communities that are being targeted right now, or it could be a moment that we turn into a very, very empowering one," she told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

### **Emojis and Fashion**

Frustrated she could not find an image to represent her and her friends on her iPhone keypad, Saudi teenager, Rayouf Alhumedhi, started an online campaign, the Hijab Emoji Project. She proposed the idea of the emoji last year to coding consortium Unicode that manages the development of new emojis, Alhumedhi said on her campaign's website, helping to prompt Apple to create its hijab-wearing emoji.

"It's only really in the last 18 to 24 months - perhaps three years - that bigger mainstream brands have started to realise that young Muslim consumers are really an exciting opportunity," said Janmohamed of Ogilvy Noor. A global Islamic economy report conducted by Thomson Reuters showed that in 2015, revenues from "modest fashion" bought by Muslim women was were estimated at \$44 billion, with designers Dolce & Gabbana, Uniqlo and Burberry entering the industry.

Janmohamed, author of the memoir "Love in a Headscarf", sees young hijabi representation in the digital communications and fashion space a step forward for tolerance. "It feels particularly empowering for young people to see themselves represented. So today I think it is the least that consumers expect and anyone that doesn't do it is actually falling behind." — Reuters

### ISRAEL REMOVES METAL DETECTORS AMID...

They decided "to change the inspection with metal detectors to a security inspection based on advanced technologies and other means," Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office said. Details of the advanced technologies envisaged were not immediately clear. A statement from the Waqf, the Islamic endowments organization which administers the compound, said there should be "no entry into Al-Aqsa mosque until after an assessment by a Waqf technical committee and the return of the situation to how it was before the 14th of this month".

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan urged all Muslims to visit Jerusalem to protect the holy places. "Anyone who has the opportunity should visit Jerusalem, Al-Aqsa mosque," Erdogan said in Ankara. "Come, let's all protect Jerusalem." Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas, who froze contacts with Israel over the dispute last week, was expected to make a statement later.

Israel installed metal detectors at entrances to the compound after the July 14 attack nearby killed two policemen. Palestinians viewed the new security measures as Israel asserting further control over the site and refused to enter the compound. Israeli authorities said the detectors were needed because the attackers smuggled guns into the compound and emerged from it to shoot the officers.

The decision to remove the detectors followed talks between Netanyahu and Jordan's King Abdullah II, who demanded that they be taken away. Jordan is the official custodian of Muslim holy sites in Jerusalem and is one of only two Arab governments to have signed a peace treaty with Israel. It also came after one of US President Donald Trump's top aides, Jason Greenblatt, arrived in Israel for talks on the crisis and with UN Middle East envoy Nickolay Mladenov warning of the risks of escalation.

A separate diplomatic standoff between Israel and Jordan may have helped push negotiations on the met-

al detectors along. On Sunday night in Amman, an Israeli embassy security guard shot dead a Jordanian who attacked him with a screwdriver, according to Israeli officials. A second Jordanian was also killed, apparently by accident. Israel had insisted the security guard had diplomatic immunity and rejected Jordanian demands to question him.

But on Monday night, the guard and other diplomats arrived home after a deal also involving the mosque compound. "Amman authorized the Israeli diplomat to leave the country after hearing his account of the incident... and after reaching an understanding with the (Israeli) government on Al-Aqsa," a Jordanian government source said.

Yesterday, thousands of Jordanians chanted "Death to Israel" at the funeral of the 17-year-old said to have attacked the guard. Mourners accompanied Mohammed Jawawdeh's coffin from Wihdat city, home to a large Palestinian refugee camp. "Mohammed's blood did not flow in vain," Jawawdeh's uncle Sami said, arguing it paved the way for Israel's removal of the metal detectors.

Friday's main weekly Muslim prayers in Jerusalem - which typically draw thousands to Al-Aqsa - had brought the dispute to a boil. Clashes erupted between Israeli security forces and Palestinians around the Old City, elsewhere in annexed east Jerusalem and in the occupied West Bank, leaving three Palestinians dead. They continued on Saturday, leaving two more Palestinians dead. Friday evening also saw a Palestinian break into a home in a Jewish settlement in the West Bank during a Sabbath dinner and stab four Israelis, killing three.

The mosque compound has served as a rallying cry for Palestinians. In 2000, a visit to it by then Israeli opposition leader Ariel Sharon helped ignite the second Palestinian intifada, or uprising. The compound lies in east Jerusalem, seized by Israel in the Six-Day War of 1967 and later annexed in a move never recognized by the international community. Considered the third-holiest site in Islam, it is the most sacred for Jews. — AFP

### **DEMOLITIONS GATHER** PACE IN HEART OF ETHIOPIAN CAPITAL

babaker sat in his car staring through the window at the remains of his failing sacross the road. "It was my father's," he told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "He lived here for more than 40 years. We used to have cafe, a hotel and restaurant here." By the time the demolition in this part of central Addis Ababa happened Ababaker's father had retired, leaving the business to his son who

maintained it as a souvenir shop. Business was good, he said, but he and his neighbors had been counting the clock with the area around being demolished. Nonetheless the razing of his house and shop, both in same week last month, came as a shock. "We just heard rumors. There was no communication from the officials," he said, one of a rising number of people voicing concerns over the way the government is rebuilding the heart of the Ethiopian capital.

For as a revised master plan for Ethiopia's capital enters implementation stage, slum clearance has stepped up a gear and the focus moved away from the city's peripheries after mass protests against evictions and displacement there last year. The new plan is restricted to city boundaries and focuses on the city centre where some 360 hectares and over 3,000 homes are slated to be demolished over the next three years, said Million Girma, head of the city's urban renewal agency, the Land Development and Urban Renewal Agency. "All eyes are now back on Addis," said Bisrat Kifle, an architect and urban planning expert based in the capital.

### **Land Values Boom**

According to UN-Habitat more than 80 percent of Addis Ababa's inner city is slum, the majority of which is government-owned 'kebele' housing dating back decades. In 2011, the municipality decided to clear all government housing in the city center to make a modern business district. The government also extended the nationalization of urban land and eliminated all remaining forms of transferable and inherited private property in the city.

Renovation programs intensified in the subsequent years, often with the demolition of entire neighborhoods. From 2009 to 2015, the city expropriated about 400 hectares of inner-city land and tore down a total of 23,151 dilapidated houses, according to UN-Habitat. At the same time land in central Addis Ababa shot up in value, providing an added incentive for rapid redevelopment, with a lease in the commercial centre of Addis Ababa now costing up to \$15,000 per square metre, making urban land in the capital some of the most expensive in Africa. "There is a high demand for land from private and government investors," Girma told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "We have to prepare Addis's land to deliver this."

In one area, located in the shadow of the new AU (African Union) building, residents evicted in April said their entire neighbourhood was cleared in the space of days. "At first they told us we could stay until after the rainy season," 19-year-old Tsegaye told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "But suddenly they arrived and said there was an 'extraordinary situation' that meant we only had three days." Residents in several districts across the inner city complained to the Thomson Reuters Foundation that the process had been sudden and disruptive. "There was no warning," said Fedlu, 30, who had been privately renting land near the five-star Sheraton Hotel. "There was no consultation ... They just tell us to leave the area, but we don't have any replacement or compensation. We feel like second-class citizens."

### **Safeguards Needed**

According to federal law in Ethiopia all evicted private landowners are entitled to a new plot of land and financial compensation to build a new home. Tenants in government housing are offered priority access to apartments in new government high-rises for those who can afford mortgages or publicly-owned rental housing for those who cannot. Those affected should be relocated within a one kilometre radius, according to the revised master plan.

Since all land in Ethiopia is officially owned by the state, financial compensation for private homeowners is based on the physical worth of the property, which is often old and undervalued compared with the informal market. "It's absolutely not enough," said Ababaker, who told the Thomson Reuters Foundation he had received 340,000 ETB (\$14,733.41) and land 15 km away. "I'm not willing to go there. It's too far and the electricity and water isn't ready." Other affected residents, most of whom were public tenants, complained that they were still living in the area because they had nowhere to else to go. —Reuters

### INDIA'S WOMEN COPS TAKE A STAND

Il-female police units are shaking up the male-dominated force in conservative northwest India, hitting the streets to combat sex crimes and a pervasive culture of silence around rape. One such squad in Jaipur has been patrolling bus stops, colleges and parks where women are vulnerable to sexual harassment. Women can face a barrage on India's streets, enduring everything from lewd jokes and strangers following them - often dismissed as innocent "eve teasing" - to physical attacks and rape.

"The message we want to send out is that we have zero tolerance towards crimes against women," said Kamal Shekhawat, who heads the specialist Jaipur unit established in late May. India has a gruesome record on sex crimes, with nearly 40,000 rapes reported every year. But the real figure is thought to be much higher, with victims wary of how their complaints will be dealt with. India's police force is overwhelmingly male - women make up just seven percent of officers - and activists complain that victims are often judged by their appearance, asked probing questions, or even blamed for provoking the crime.

The shame attached to rape in India's deeply patriarchal society, and fear of reprisal, means many sex crimes are not reported and offenders go unpunished. Shekhawat hopes the visible presence of female officers on the beat will encourage more women in Jaipur to report their abusers knowing they will find a sympathetic ear. "Women police are more empathetic and victims also feel more confident and are able to communicate openly before them," she said.

### **Boosting confidence**

At a park in Jaipur, constable Saroj Chodhuary dismounted from her scooter and approached a group of sariclad women to introduce herself. "You can just make a call or even message on WhatsApp and we will be right there," she said, clad in khaki uniform and white helmet as she passed around her details. "Your identity will not be revealed, so you can feel free to register your complaint. If someone makes cat calls or troubles you in any way, do let us know. Don't take law in your own hands."

The women appear impressed by her authority -Chodhuary and her colleagues are trained in martial arts and spent months learning the law - and relieved to know help was just a phone call away. Radha Jhabua, a 24-yearold mother, said she wanted to complain about a neighbor stalking her but her husband feared it would bring the family a bad name. "He told me to keep quiet and wait for the man to change his ways. I am glad we can now just send a Whatsapp message to these sisters and they will take care of the rest," she told AFP. Seema Sahu, a 38-yearold mother of two, said she usually avoided going out at in Udaipur last October. Police in neighbouring Uttar night with her daughters. "I am so glad now these police women will be on the roads. Their very presence gives us confidence," she said.

### **Restoring order**

India faced international scrutiny over levels of violence against women following the fatal gang-rape of a medical student in New Delhi in Dec 2012. Laws to punish sex offenders were strengthened in the aftermath, but attacks are still widespread. In the capital New Delhi alone there were 2,199 rape cases in 2015 - an average of six a day.India's police has been ordered to recruit more female officers so women make up a third of the force.

But so far, their numbers remain low. The Jaipur unit is just the second in Rajasthan state, with the first established Pradesh have come under fire for their controversial approach to combat sex-related crimes in the notoriously lawless state. There officers, including women, patrolling in so-called "anti-Romeo squads" have been accused of harassing unmarried and interfaith couples in an effort to enforce a moral code reflecting Hindu values.

Shekhawat said no such methods would be adopted under her watch. "We have seen a very good impact and positive results wherever our teams are on patrol," she said. 'It is having a preventive effect. It is restoring the faith of the public in the police which is a must for maintaining law and order." Men are taking note, too. "It's a very good move. When a man gets rounded up by these women, others will automatically feel the heat. They will have to mend their ways," said Jaipur resident Ram Lal Gujar. — AFP

### SMUGGLERS OFFER RIGS AS 'VIP TREATMENT' TO US

hen Thomas Homan, the acting director of US Immigration and Customs Enforcement, was awakened Sunday morning with news that migrants were found dead inside a sweltering tractor-trailer outside a San Antonio Walmart, his mind flashed back to 2003, when he stood at the back of a truck about 200 km southeast of San Antonio that carried 19 dead migrants. "It is sad that 14 years later people are still being smuggled in tractor-trailers," he said. "There still isn't water, there still isn't ventilation. These criminal organizations, they're all about making money."

The striking similarities of the Texas tragedies demonstrate how smugglers have found a durable business model carrying large groups - often in big rigs through an elaborate network of foot guides, safe house operators and drivers. A criminal complaint about Sunday's discovery that 10 were dead and dozens injured in the truck opens a window on their degree of sophistication and organizational muscle: Passengers had color-coded tape to split into smaller groups; and six black SUVs awaited them at one transit point to bring them to their destinations.

Big rigs emerged as a popular smuggling method in the early 1990s amid a surge in US border enforcement in San Diego and El Paso, Texas, which were then the busiest corridors for illegal crossings. Before that, people paid small fees to momand-pop operators to get them across a largely unguarded border. As crossing became exponentially more difficult after the 2001 terror strikes in the US, migrants

were led through more dangerous terrain and paid thousands of dollars more.

Guadalupe Correa-Cabrera, a political scientist who teaches at University of Texas, Rio Grande Valley, said migrants she interviewed last year in South Texas paid \$2,000

tractor-trailers, considering them more effective, faster and safer than walking through the desert to a pickup point far from the border. Hundreds of border crossers perish each year in the desert, getting lost and dehydrated in extreme heat.

to \$3,000 more to ride in the crammed

The growing use of trucks coincided with increased trade with Mexico under the North American Free Trade Agreement, allowing smugglers to more easily blend in with cargo, particularly on Interstate 35 from Laredo, Texas, to San Antonio, Correa-Cabrera said. Walking in the open desert more easily exposes them to US Border Patrol agents. Women, some carrying children, think they are less likely to be raped on a truck than in the open desert because there are more witnesses. Correia-Cabrera said. Riding in a big rig, she said, is "the VIP

treatment". For smugglers, the advantage of tractortrailers boils down to scale. "It's like any other business: the more they move, the more profit they make," Homan said. "Rather than taking four in a car, the profit margin on tractor-trailers is a lot more." Truck drivers are low-level cogs in a big machine, recruited in the US at casinos and other places where smuggling organizations look for people who are down on their luck, desperate for quick cash and disinclined to ask questions. — AP



### **BORDEAUX GIVE** WELLINGTON BOOT

**BORDEAUX:** Brazilian midfielder Wellington Silva's transfer to French club Bordeaux from Fluminense has been cancelled after he failed a medical, the Lique 1 club said yesterday. "Following a medical visit, Bordeaux decid-

ed not to complete the transfer of Wellington Silva," the club said in a statement. The 24-year-old arrived in western France last Sunday and had been due to be officially presented to the press yesterday afternoon. A Brazilian youth international, Wellington Silva was recruited by Arsenal in 2011 but could not play in England because of work permit problems. During six seasons in Europe he was loaned to clubs in Spain before returning to England to play for Bolton after acquiring Spanish nationality. He returned to his first club Fluminense in 2016, playing his last match on July 13 against Botafogo. — AFP

### **EX-IRELAND STAR** O'LEARY RETIRES

LONDON: Former Ireland and Munster scrum-half Tomas O'Leary announced his retirement yesterday. O'Leary made his name on international stage when he started four of Ireland's five games in their victorious 2009 Six Nations campaign. It was only Ireland's second Grand Slam and their first since 1948. O'Leary was selected for the 2009 British and Irish Lions tour of South Africa before being ruled out by a broken ankle sustained while on Munster duty. Corkborn O'Leary, who won 24 Ireland caps, also won the European Cup twice with Munster in 2006 and 2008. "I have had an incredible career from my academy days in Munster to my last game in Montpellier, all of which have been extremely satisfying," O'Leary wrote in announcing his retirement on the Navy Blue blog. "I have realised my ambition of representing Munster and Ireland. "Wearing the red and green jerseys has been a real honour. —AFP

### **AUSSIE TENNIS GREAT** MERVYN ROSE DIES

SYDNEY: Australian two-time Grand Slam singles champion Mervyn Rose, who went on to coach greats Margaret Court and Billie Jean King, has died, tennis officials said yesterday. Rose, who won the Australian Open and French Open along with five Grand Slam doubles titles, was 87. "The tennis family is mourning the passing of seven-time Grand Slam champion Mervyn Rose and our thoughts are with his family and friends," said Tennis Australia. Rose claimed his first major title at the 1954 Australian Open, defeating defending champion and top seed Ken Rosewall on the way to the final, where he beat his long-time doubles partner Rex Hartwig. A left-hander known for perfecting the art of chip and charge, he went on to win at Roland Garros four years later, overcoming Chile's Luis Ayala in the final. Rose was also part of Australia's 1951 and 1957 Davis Cup-winning teams, reaching a career-high three in the world. —AFP

### INJURED RUTHERFORD TO MISS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

**LONDON:** Britain's Greg Rutherford has been ruled out of the World Championships in London after the defending long jump champion suffered an ankle injury. Rutherford, who won Olympic gold at London 2012, was forced to withdraw from his title defence after failing to recover from the ligament damage he sustained competing in Italy last month.

The 30-year-old's absence was announced by British Athletics yesterday. "In the last few days I have had to accept an unfortunate reality. I did everything I could, but a string of injuries at the worst possible time means I will be unable to defend my world title in London," Rutherford said in a statement.

"With an incredible start to the year in training, and very promising early season form, I have had a difficult series of setbacks as the season progressed. "Most recently, a badly damaged ankle ligament and a sportsman's hernia, really put paid to my plans. The injuries have taken longer to heal than we hoped, and I have been unable to even jump at all in training, let alone compete

"I am truly gutted. That stadium is such a

special place for me, I am so devastated that I won't be competing in front of the best fans in the world, in the stadium that changed my life. "But, I'll definitely be there to support my British team mates and soak up what will be an amazing atmosphere, and an amazing championships.

"My focus will now turn to 2018 and becoming a three time European champion on the trot, something no long jumper has ever done before." As well as an Olympic title, Rutherford also claimed the Commonwealth Games crown and European gold medal in 2014.

Rutherford's withdrawal is a big blow for British Athletics ahead of the World Championships, which starts next week. Britain's Performance director Neil Black said: "Greg is one of only a few British athletes to complete the 'Grand Slam' of medals, but that won't make missing London any easier.

"He desperately wanted to defend his world title in front of the home crowd, but unfortunately his injury hasn't cleared up in time and the hard but sensible decision had to be made to withdraw." — AFP



### **BOLT HEADLINES JAMAICA'S** WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

KINGSTON: Sprint superstar Usain Bolt is one of three Rio Olympic gold medalists leading a 59-strong Jamaican team named Monday for next month's athletics World Championships in London. Bolt has said he intends to run the 100m and the 4x100m relay at the worlds, his final event before retiring.

He's one of two reigning world champions, along with sprint hurdler Danielle Williams, who will be defending titles they won in China two years go. Elaine Thompson, who won the Olympic Sprint double last year in Rio, and Omar McLeodthe first man for the Caribbean island to win Olympic 110m hurdles gold-are also in the team published by the Jamaica Athletics Administrative Association.

The team also includes sprint hurdler Hansle Parchment, shot putter O'Dayne Richards and 400m runner Shericka Jackson-all individual medalists in Beijing two years ago. Fedrick Dacres, the second ranked male discus thrower in the world, will attend his second World Championships.

Meanwhile, champion hurdler Sally Pearson and walker Jared Tallent headlined a 48-strong Australian team announced yesterday for next month's world athletics championships in London. The country's largest world title squad since Seville in 1999 includes 20 debutants from the Olympic Games in Rio last year.

"It ensures that we are likely to see a competitive few months ahead as athletes seek nomination for selection to the Australia Commonwealth Games Team," Athletics Australia said. The Commonwealth Games next year are on home soil at the Gold Coast. Australia won two silvers at the last world championships in Beijing two years ago-Tallent in the 50km walk and Fabrice Lapierre in the long jump.

### PEATY BREAKS 50M BREAST RECORD

**BUDAPEST:** He's done it again. Britain's Adam Peaty set a world record of 26.10 seconds in the preliminaries of the men's 50 meter breaststroke at the world championships yesterday. Peaty, who won gold in the 100 breaststroke on Monday, shaved 0.32 of a second off the record he had previously set at the previous worlds in Kazan, Russia, two years ago. "I was quite relaxed. I wasn't going out there this morning for a world record, just going out there to race and qualify for the semis," said the 22-year-old Briton, who added that it was "quite early (in the morning) for a world record. But I'm very

happy with that swim." Peaty is bidding to be the first man to retain the 50 breaststroke title at a worlds, and he wasn't surprised to beat his previous best-mark. "That world record is two years old. It was kind of due another push on," said Peaty, still buzzing after Monday's gold. "Last night gave me the confidence. I was out in 26.5 and I was like, 'This is so easy.' I can definitely push on for a 50.' That didn't really feel like my best race."

Cameron van der Burgh of South Africa was next fastest in the non-Olympic event, a significant 0.44 behind. It's the second world record set at this year's championships after Sweden's Sarah Sjostrom established a split of 51.71 in the women's 4x100 free relay on

Meanwhile, Olympic and world champion Katie Ledecky eased to victory in her heat of the women's 200 freestyle, clocking 1:56.27, two tenths of a second slower than world record holder Federica Pellegrini, who finished ahead of home favorite Katinka Hosszu

"I knew where I wanted to be," Ledecky said. "The only thing I had to do this morning was get a lane for tonight. Just wanted to go out and win my heat. It didn't really matter what the time was. I knew that would put me in a good position for tonight." Ledecky, who cruised to a dominating victory in the 400 free and put the U.S. ahead for gold in the 4x100 free relay on Sunday, is facing her most challenging day at the championships. She also has the 1,500 free final later, less than an hour before she returns for the 200 free semifinal.

The American star needs to get her times right outside of the pool, too. "Just planning it all out, making sure I know where I'm going at all times," Ledecky said. "Lot going on when there's medal ceremonies and warmdown and getting to the ready room. Just all those little things. Try to limit the walking and stay off my feet as much as I can during that whole process."

Ledecky is pleased with the setup in terms of distance between pool, ready

room and practice pool at the purposebuilt Duna Arena. "Yeah, it's pretty good. Just lining it all up beforehand and making sure I can get everywhere I need to go pretty quickly. It's pretty warm upstairs," Ledecky said. "Just tryin' to stay cool and

manage it all really well."

### LE CLOS BRACED TO RACE IN WORLDS 'LION'S DEN'

bracing himself to race in Budapest's 'lion's den' atmosphere against home-town favourite Laszlo Cseh in the 200m butterfly at the world aquatic championships.

"Laszlo and Kenderesi are both good friends, they are the favourites. I'm probably only fourth as it stands."

Cseh won the world title in Kazan two years ago with Le Clos having to settle for silver. With US swim superstar Michael Phelps now back in retirement, the South African wants the gold in Budapest. Cseh was the

Le Clos, the 2012 Olympic and 2013 world champion, was fifth fastest at 1.82secs back, but said it was all part of the plan. "I knew Laszlo was going to be quick, he likes to go home fast in the morning," said Le Clos.

"I love all the heats, you know me I like to play games. "It's ok. We'll shave a bit (of time off) tonight and get ready for tomorrow." Le Clos also explained why he was a no-show for the men's 200m freestyle heats on Monday, the event in which he won a silver medal at the 2016 Olympics.

"We decided about three weeks ago not to swim, I did a time trial about 10 days ago and I was about 1.47.0," said Le Clos. "I realised I'm probably not in the right shape to go 1.44 here. "I don't think to be honest that's going to be good enough for me this time around, so we'll see.

"But definitely in the Commonwealth Games next year, and definitely in 2020 (the Tokyo Olympics), I'm back." — AFP

Rose averaged 18 points, 3.8 rebounds and 4.4 assists in 64 games for the New York Knicks last season. He was acquired in a trade with the Chicago Bulls, but the 2016-17 season ended in another injury Rose's time with the Bulls was marred by a series of knee injuries, the first of them torn left knee ligaments in the opening game of the 2012 playoffs.

He missed the entire 2012-13 season and played less than a month into the 2013-14 campaign before a season-ending right knee injury. He missed 20 games in the 2014-15 season after another right knee operation. —AFP

### **DIAMONDBACKS 10, BRAVES 2**

J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run to help Zack Greinke and the Diamondbacks cruise to a win over the Braves, Martinez, hitless in his first five at-bats as a Diamondback after coming over in a trade with the Detroit Tigers last week, hammered a 1-2 pitch from reliever Matt Wisler high off the center field batters eye with nobody out in the bottom of the sixth. It was his 17th home run of the season. Greinke (12-4) pitched eight innings and allowed two runs on five hits with six strikeouts. He's 10-0 in 12 starts at Chase Field this season. Greinke added a run-scoring double in the second inning and a pair of sacrifices. A.J. Pollock hit a two-run homer, doubled twice and drove in four runs, and Jeff Mathis reached base four times with three singles and a walk, scoring twice for the Diamondbacks. R.A. Jordy Mercer added a three-run homer of his own in the eighth to further back Cole (8-7), 5-1 in his last eight starts. That lone defeat came June 30 as San Francisco swept the Pirates at Pittsburgh from June 30-July 2 the Giants' first in the series since 2009. This time, Pittsburgh immediately jumped on San Francisco starter Matt Cain (3-9), who matched the longest losing streak of his career at eight games - also done from July 28, 2015-May 10, 2016. Giants manager Bruce Bochy was ejected by plate umpire Chris Conroy for arguing balls and strikes in support of Cain moments after McCutchen connected, the skipper's second time being tossed this year.

### **ASTROS 13, PHILLIES 4**

Jose Altuve had two doubles and two singles, stretched his sizzling hitting streak to 16 games and helped the Astros beat the Phillies.

A day after tying his career high for hits in a game at Baltimore, Altuve got four more and drove in three runs while raising his major league-leading average to .365. ### JOHN ELWAY AGREES TO 5-YEAR CONTRACT WITH DENVER BRONCOS

**ENGLEWOOD:** One leadership saga down, another one continues for the Denver Broncos. John Elway agreed to a new five-year contract on Monday, ending a long-running story line that had fans wondering if their Hall of Fame QB-turned-GM might leave the franchise he's led to three Super Bowl titles.

Elway had insisted ever since the club approached him last October about a new deal that he wasn't going anywhere. Yet, as months passed without an agreement, the issue came to dominate discussions about the Broncos along with their quarterback

puzzle. Their on-field leader will be determined over the next few weeks as Trevor Siemian and Paxton Lynch resume their much-hyped QB competition. The Broncos begin their seventh training camp under Elway's front office leadership on Thursday.

"During these last six seasons, John's clearly established himself as one of the best general managers in all of sports. He's demonstrated impressive football instincts, a strong business acumen and a consistent ability to build competitive teams," team President Joe Ellis said in a statement.

"There's no doubt John means a

great deal to the Broncos, our fans and the entire community. It was important for us to reach this long-term agreement, and we're all excited to now turn our full attention toward the 2017 season." Elway was set to enter the final year of his contract as general manager and executive vice president of football operations. The sides tore up the final year of his old contract and added four more seasons, through 2021. "Well deserved!!!," tweeted Broncos All-Pro cornerback Aqib Talib . "#Legend on the field and in the office!!!"

In his 22 seasons with the franchise, including 16 as a player, the Broncos

have fewer losing seasons (two) than Lombardi Trophies (three). Elway led Denver to Super Bowl wins after the 1997 and '98 seasons to cap his Hall of Fame playing career. He returned to his beloved Broncos in 2011, and from the front office has led them to a 77-33 record with five playoff appearances and a win over Carolina in Super Bowl 50. Only New England (86-26) is better over that span.

During his six seasons as an executive, Elway is the only GM in the league who has acquired future Pro Bowl players through the draft, street free agency, unrestricted free agency and college free agency. Ellis has been running the franchise for the last few years with owner Pat Bowlen battling Alzheimer's.

"I appreciate the trust and confidence that Joe has shown in me," Elway said in a statement. "Pat Bowlen has always put outstanding leadership in place, and I'm grateful for the support Joe gives us to compete for championships each and every year. This is a special place, and the Broncos are home to me. While there's still a lot of work to be done, I'm excited about the future of this team and this organization." — AP

### CHELSEA STAR KENEDY SENT HOME OVER CHINA SLURS

**LONDON:** Kenedy has been sent home from Chelsea's pre-season tour of Asia as punishment for his offensive social media posts about China, according to reports yesterday. Brazilian defender Kenedy was axed from Chelsea's high-profile tour as the Premier League champions fought to avoid further embarrassment after the social media slurs sparked a furious response in China.

The 21-year-old put two videos on Instagram, one with a caption which translated as "F\*\*k you China" and another of a security guard asleep which was tagged: "Wake up China. You idiot." Kenedy posted the messages ahead of a friendly against Arsenal in Beijing on Saturday and was jeered by the crowd during Chelsea's 3-0 win. Chelsea had already issued an apology after admitting Kenedy's actions had caused "great offence and hurt the feelings of the people of China". Kenedy, signed from Fluminense for £6 million (\$7.8 million) in 2015, flew with Chelsea to Singapore over the weekend and trained with the team on Sunday and Monday.

But, with Kenedy accused by Chinese media of humiliating their country, reports claimed the Blues were forced to remove the player from their pre-season preparations as they look to salvage the club's reputation and maintain their position in the lucrative Asian market. Antonio Conte's side are due to face Bayern Munich in a friendly on Tuesday, then take on Inter Milan on Saturday, and the Blues boss is certain to face a barrage of questions about Kenedy's behaviour and his reported exile. Chinese fans had already blasted Kenedy's racist jibes, leading to an apology from the player who quickly deleted the posts. " would like to apologise to the people of China for the offence I have caused. It was never my intention to insult or offend anyone at all and I now realise that my comments were totally inappropriate," Kenedy wrote. "I wish to state that I have tremendous respect and admiration for the Chinese people and their country.

"I would also like to apologise to my club Chelsea and all my companions who I have let down by my posts. I fully understand the responsibility of representing my club and it was never my intention to cause this embarrassment nor disrespect."

Kenedy's outbursts could leave his future at Stamford Bridge in jeopardy. The full-back was sent on a season-long loan to Watford last term, but made just one substitute appearance before the spell was cut short. He went on to make two appearances for Chelsea after they wrapped up the Premier League title. — AFP

### REAL MADRID CLINCH WORLD RECORD DEAL FOR MBAPPE

PARIS: Real Madrid have reportedly reached a ings and 16 in Ligue 1 as he exploded onto the Mendy to Manchester City in a world record 52 world record deal in principle to sign Kylian Mbappe from Monaco for 180 million euros (\$210m, £160m), closing one of the hottest transfer sagas of the summer.

Spanish sports daily Marca, citing sources close to the negotiations, said the gifted teenage striker who shot to stardom last season is expected to join Real "in the next few days" on a six year deal. French newspapers Le Parisien and Nice Matin were quick to announce that Monaco had denied the report. But in the cloak and dagger climate of rumour and innuendo that characterises football's transfer operations, the latest twist revived speculation surrounding the future of Europe's most-eligible young star. Only the rumour mill surrounding Neymar and the massive sums involved have come close to eclipsing the buzz generated by Mbappe in recent weeks. Neymar, Barcelona's 25-year-old Brazilian superstar, is at the centre of frenzied speculation linking him to Paris Saint-Germain for a world record 222-million-euro.

### **CIRCLING PREDATORS**

The likelihood of that deal looks to have receded in the past few days as the Mbappe move takes centre stage. And if it goes through, Real will have completed a major coup by snatching one of the most coveted young players in football from under the noses of top European clubs including PSG and Premier League giants including Manchester City.

Real, currently on tour in the United States and due to play Manchester City in Los Angeles on Wednesday, have yet to comment on the Spanish report. But Marca, known to have strong links to the Madrid club, insisted that Real are set to pay between 150-160m euros with add-ons of between 20 and 30m for Mbappe, dwarfing the current world transfer record of 105m Manchester United paid to lure Paul Pogba from Juventus last year. Real are looking to fill the void left by Alvaro Morata who joined Premier League champions Chelsea last Friday in a deal reported to be worth up to 80 million euros.

Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane, asked about Mbappe last week, said that Real were short one attacker after Morata's departure but chose his words carefully. "I am not saying we are lacking a centre forward but we are short of one attacker, that's how things are," he said. "We will see how we will manage that."

If he does arrive at Zidane's European champions the 18-year-old will be on a net annual salary of "seven million" euros, Marca said. Mbappe, under contract at Monaco until 2019, has been wooed so hard by some of Europe's top clubs that Monaco raised the red card and warned the circling predators that they could be reported to FIFA, world football's governing body. "Top European football clubs made contact with Kylian MbappÈ and his entourage without our authorisation," Monaco said on their website. The club said they wanted to remind these clubs that such actions are contrary to French and international regulations. Mbappe scored six goals in 10 Champions League out-

### KOHLI TELLS INDIA TO SHOW S Lanka who's number one

GALLE: Two years ago Virat Kohli's India start- years to come. They are expected to defend ed a series in Śri Lanka as the team almost anyone could beat, today they take to the field in Galle as the team to beat.

India may have been nervous last time, but now Kohli says the side has come full circle with "no massive areas of concern" as they seek to strengthen their hold on number one Test nation status.

Two years ago, India had not won a series in seven attempts. They lost the opening Galle Test and it was an electro-shock. They won that series 2-1. India have since been embroiled in near chaos off the field-the governing body put under Supreme Court administration and a coach forced out by clashes with the captainbut near domination in competition: 13 Tests played, 10 won, two drawn and just one defeat. Kohli said yesterday that he wants a definitive end to the drama over the departure of Anil Kumble as coach and a winning start to the new era with Ravi Shastri. "We have spoken enough about these issues and it is something that we are not focusing on at all now," the skipper Kohli said.

"We are just looking forward to the cricket now and in this series to showcase our skills and have consistent performances, which we have had as a side ever since we started our climb back in the rankings."

Kohli said Sri Lanka can expect a different start and that India can dominate Tests for their top Test ranking in South Africa, England and Australia in the next year.

"It's pretty different sitting here two years after that particular series," Kohli said of the last Sri Lanka games. Those Tests were "very important in us coming together as a team in believing that we can win a series and not just matches. So that was the beginning of that mindset." The captain added: "I think we have built a really good base for us as a team to be able to do that consistently over the next few years. "We are pretty humble in our preparations and do the hard yards every game that we play. "We have all bases covered strongly." India have ruled opening batsman Lokesh Rahul out of the first Test with a viral fever. Kohli said there would be no experiments with the opening lineup, which means Shikhar Dhawan and Abhinav Mukund should start the batting.

"I don't think there are any massive areas of concern for us," Kohli said. "We've been looking to fine-tune smaller areas during the course of the game, which probably people might not be able to pick up." Kohli said the onus was on the Indian players to "put us into a position where we can't lose.

"We have been able to put ourselves in a position in games, 80-85 percent of the games, where there's only one winner left. "That's the kind of sustained pressure that we've been able to build." — AFP

### NOURI OUT OF COMA, BUT **BRAIN DAMAGE UNCHANGED**

**AMSTERDAM:** Stricken Ajax midfielder accompanied by Abdelhak Nouri, who suffered serious, lasting brain damage after collapsing during a friendly, has been transferred out of intensive care, and can breathe on his own, the club said yesterday.

The 20-year-old is being cared for at the Academic Medical Centre in first team last season and had made Amsterdam, where he was brought on nine appearances in the Dutch top no longer in an induced coma and has full respiratory functions," the club said, in a statement issued in the name of Nouri's family.

But it added soberly that "his condition further remains unchanged from previous updates and is stable, but with serious and permanent brain damage." Tributes have poured in from across The Netherlands and from abroad for the youngster, affectionately known as Appie, who joined the Amsterdam club at age seven and was a promising prospect.

Nouri suffered irregular heart problems in a pre-season friendly against German side Werder Bremen in Austria on July 8 and collapsed. He was resuscitated and flown to an Innsbruck hospital by helicopter.

At first the news seemed positive, but hopes for a quick recovery were shattered when Ajax later announced he had suffered massive brain damage, most due to a lack of oxygen. Dozens of visitors have flocked to the Amsterdam hospital grounds to pay tribute to Nouri since he arrived back in the country on July 14.

A large hedge 100 metres (yards) from the entrance is decked with Ajax scarves, flowers, poems, children's drawings and Ajax shirts bearing Nouri's number 34, all

the slogan '#StayStrongAppie'.

"The whole country is affected, not just Amsterdam. It was like it happened to our son," said Connie, a mother of four who went to the hospital to lay roses. ### LEDECKY WINS HISTORIC 12TH WORLD GOLD

### Sun powers to 200m freestyle world gold

**BUDAPEST:** Katie Ledecky of the United States made history yesterday by becoming the first woman to win 12 world swimming championship gold medals with victory in the 1500m freestyle. Ledecky, 20, clocked 15 minutes, 31.82 seconds with Spain's Mireia Belmonte taking silver at a huge 19.07secs back, while Italy's Simona

Quadarella earned bronze at 22.04.

Ledecky now has 12 gold medals from world championships making her the most decorated female as she passed Missy Franklin of the USA, who has 11 worlds gold medals. This was Ledecky's third gold of these championships-

from a possible six she could finish with-and she led from the start.

Earlier, Chinese superstar Sun Yang won the men's 200m freestyle gold at the world aquatics championships on Tuesday to add to his Olympic title in the same event. Sun touched the wall first in one minute 44.39 seconds with Townley Haas of the United States taking silver, at 0.65sec back, while Russia's Aleksandr Krasnykh earned bronze at 0.84.

"I paid attention to detail and followed the instructions of my coach," said Sun, who punched the water in triumph after his victory.

This was Sun's second gold of these championships after his victory in the 400m freestyle final on Sunday.

He will bid for the treble in today's 800m freestyle final-the event he has dominated for the last three world championships since 2011 in Shanghai. Sun timed his 200m race to perfection. He was fourth at the halfway point, but had caught leader and defending champion James Guy of Great Britain, who finished fifth, by the final turn and powered home to victory.

His win means the 25-year-old Sun is now the 200m freestyle champion at both the worlds and

Olympics, after his victory at the Rio de Janeiro Games last year. The freestyle expert now has nine gold medals to his name spanning four world championships. He holds a world title in each of the 200m, 400m, 800m and 1500m freestyle events. Haas said he pushed through the pain barrier to grab silver.

"Last 50 metres hurt," said the 20-year-old, a gold medallist in the 4x100m relay in Budapest. "I couldn't see Sun Yang, but I could see James Guy's arms so in my head I thought 'I've got to stay ahead of him', then I put my head down and kept kicking."

Guy, the 2015 world champion, was disappointed, especially after Britain's double golds on Monday when Adam Peaty won the 100m breaststroke and Ben Proud took the 50m butterfly title. "It was very disappointing, yesterday I did it exactly the same way, I felt like I had more left to give on the last leg, especially towards the

finish," said Guy.

"With my roommate (Peaty) winning gold and
Ben Proud winning gold, I want to get there too,
but everything happens for a reason and I have a
four-year plan," he added, with an eye on the
Tokyo 2020 Olympics. (See Page 13). — AFP

### NETHERLANDS, DENMARK IN WOMEN'S EURO QUARTERS

**DEVENTER:** Hosts Netherlands beat neighbours Belgium 2-1 to advance to the women's Euro quarter-finals alongside Denmark, who edged 2013 runners-up Norway 1-0 in Group A on Monday. In Tilburg, Sherida Spitse converted a penalty-her second in two games — in the 27th minute to put the Netherlands ahead after Maud Coutereels had brought down Jackie Groenen in the box.

Tessa Wullaert put Belgium level on 59 minutes with a high chip that caught out goalkeeper Sari van Veenendaal. But Lieke Martens helped the hosts keep their perfect record of three wins from as many games with a shot that was deflected by defender Heleen Jaques over keeper Justien Odeurs.

In Deventer, Denmark's Katrine Veje scored on five minutes, blasting her shot past Norwegian keeper Ingrid Hjelmseth after being set up by skipper Pernille Harder. Norway wasted a spot-kick just before halftime as Danish keeper Stina Lykke Petersen kept out Caroline Graham Hansen's shot following a foul on striker Ada Hegerberg.

Denmark finished second on six points, ahead of Belgium with three and Norway-who had advanced to the knockout stages every time since 1997 — with zero points. The Dutch were on the front foot for most of the match, with Martens firing over on 11

### I'M STAYING AT REAL: RONALDO

MADRID: Ending weeks of speculation about his future, Cristiano Ronaldo has told a Spanish newspaper he is staying put at Real Madrid to plunder more silverware. "To win important trophies with my club and the personal honours last season was brilliant, to do it again would be nice," Ronaldo told the sports daily Marca yesterday in an interview from Shanghai. Ronaldo's declaration of intent to remain at the Bernabeu for the upcoming season comes despite rumours of his departure which surfaced last month in Portuguese newspaper O Globo.

Those reports were founded on his apparent feeling of abandonment by his club over his run-in with the Spanish tax authorities. Ronaldo, 32, has been summoned to appear before a judge near Madrid on July 31 to answer four counts of evading 14.7 million euros (\$16.8 million) in taxes.

The four-time Ballon d'Or winner has protested his innocence with O Globo saying he had threatened to leave Real over the investigation. Since extending his contract last November until 2021, Ronaldo is the highest paid sports star in the world with \$93 million (83m euro) in 2016-2017, according to Forbes magazine. On Saturday Real manager Zinedine Zidane assured Real supporters that the superstar striker "was on holiday and would be back with us on (August) 5". Ronaldo has been given leave to miss the club's pre-season US tour and Zidane, speaking in Los Angeles, insisted that he would be back at the club "on the fifth (of August) and I think he'll stay for the next two or three years he's got left with us."

In yesterday's Marca interview Ronaldo also looked ahead to the 2018 World Cup with European champions Portugal. "We still have to qualify but I'm hoping that Portugal can win an incredible title." — AFP

### GREECE RAISES \$3.5BN IN MILESTONE BOND ISSUE

ATHENS: Greece broke a three-year dry spell with a successful return to the debt markets yesterday, a symbolic victory for the beleaguered eurozone nation. It even managed to borrow at cheaper rates than in 2014, the last time it tapped the international bond market, HSBC, the lead manager for the operation, told AFP. The Greek treasury sold three billion euros (\$3.5 billion) worth of five-year bonds at a rate of 4.625 percent, said Frederic Gabizon, head of European public sector debt at HSBC. That is below the 4.95 percent in Greece's last auction of bonds in 2014, reportedly the target the Greek government had set for itself in the new offer.

### Oversubscribed

Total demand for the issue came in at 6.5 billion euros, Gabizon said, making it more than twice subscribed. Half of the bonds sold were new, and half were issued to be exchanged for five-year bonds sold in 2014. Apart from HSBC, BNP Paribas, Bank of America Merrill Lynch, Citi, Deutsche Bank and Goldman Sachs also underwrote the syndicated sale.

The government announced Monday it was attempting a comeback to the debt markets, which it considers a test of confidence. Greece currently has no real need to draw money from the bond markets as it recently received renewed financial support at lower rates under its international bailout that should see it through until next year. However it is a psychological milestone, demonstrating that Greece is back on the road to weaning itself off bailout aid. It is also an opportunity for Prime Minister Alexis Tsipras to shore up support for his Syriza party. —AFP

### WITH JIMMY CHOO, MICHAEL KORS FINDS SHOES TO MATCH ITS BAGS

LONDON: In a bid to burnish its brand image, American bag and accessories maker Michael Kors is buying luxury shoemaker Jimmy Choo in a deal worth \$1.35 billion (896 million pounds).

Jimmy Choo, which counts Jennifer Lopez, Duchess of Cambridge Kate Middleton and Beyonce among its fans, has a high-level profile that tempted Michael Kors to pay a premium. Shareholders in Jimmy Choo will get 2.3 pounds in cash for each share, about 36.5 percent above the firm's share price of 1.685 pounds on April 21.

Michael Kors has struggled recently, announcing in May that it would close up to 125 stores due to weak sales. It said that Jimmy Choo is "the ideal partner" and will have its online presence bolstered as a result of the deal. Jimmy Choo CEO Pierre Dennis and Creative Director Sandra Choi

will remain in their jobs. "Jimmy Choo is poised for meaningful growth in the future and we are committed to supporting the strong brand equity that Jimmy Choo has built," said John Idol, CEO of Michael Kors.

Analysts from Jefferies said the deal could help Michael Kors rebuild its brand name, though that would happen in the longer-term and not have an immediate impact on the company's stock.


'We believe the strategic steps Kors is making to elevate its own brand are working, and believe the addition of Jimmy Choo, an iconic premium luxury brand, should be beneficial," the analysts said in a note to clients. Shares in Jimmy Choo were up 17 percent at 2.28 pounds yesterday, while Michael Kors was down 2.5 per-


"Michael Kors intends to apply the experiences, infrastructure and capabilities that it has developed as a company over the course of its


own worldwide growth as a luxury fashion brand to support the growth of Jimmy Choo." Michael Kors has secured the backing of Luxembourg-based investment firm and majority shareholder JAB Luxury, which holds 67.66 percent of Jimmy Choo.

### ATAR ECONOMIC GROWTH TO IMPROVE IN 2017

### BUT GCC DISPUTE WEIGHS ON OUTLOOK

### **NBK ECONOMIC REPORT**

**KUWAIT:** Qatar's economic growth moderated to 2.2 percent in 2016 from 3.5 percent in 2015 on a contraction in oil and gas output (-1 percent) and a slowdown in non-hydrocarbon sector activity (5.6 percent). In the former, maturing oil fields, maintenance of LNG facilities and delays prevented the Barzan gas processing plant from reaching full capacity and stymied potential output growth. Over in the nonhydrocarbon sector, while construction (15.4 percent y/y), financial services (7.9 percent y/y) and real estate (6.8 percent y/y) were the major contributors to growth, the economy felt the negative effects of government fiscal consolidation, tighter liquidity and private sector credit, and generally lower consumer confidence. Last year's GDP growth rate was the slowest since 2002.

Looking ahead, we expect growth to accelerate slightly this year and next to 2.5 percent and 3.1 percent, respectively, thanks to gains in LNG, natural gas and condensates output on the hydrocarbon side. Crude output is expected to average 30,000 b/d less in 2017 as per Qatar's obligations under the terms of last November's OPEC production cut agreement. Continued growth in construction, services and transportation should contribute on the non-hydrocarbon side. The government's \$200 billion public infrastructure program, which it is executing as part of its Vision 2030 diversification strategy and FIFA World Cup 2022 plan, will underpin growth in this sector, even while the government continues to keep a tight rein on current expenditures.

Of course, the recent diplomatic rift between Qatar and its neighbors, in which air, transport and even financial links have been severed or limited, does have the potential to significantly alter the equation and affect the outlook. Depending on how long the crisis lasts-two weeks and counting so far-the impact on the flow of goods and services, people and capital could be substantial, with negative repercussions for Qatari trade, tourism, labor and banking sector liquidity. These are all key components of Qatar's diversification strategy; limitations imposed on any one of these would cause headline growth to suffer. Inflation would almost certainly spike, as consumer goods and materials are rerouted, while the banking system, with its elevated share of foreign liabilities, could experience outflows and rising costs.

### Headline inflation to ease in 2017

Inflation averaged 2.7 percent in 2016, increasing from 2015's headline figure of 1.8 percent due to price hikes which were associated with the removal of energy and utility subsidies. This also came despite a 2 percent decline in food prices that year. As of April 2017, inflation was 0.8 percent y/y, brought lower by declining rental prices (-1.3 percent y/y) and falling costs in the recreation and culture category (-2.6 percent y/y). Rent inflation, which feeds into the largest CPI contributor-the housing and utilities category-turned negative in February for the first time in 5 years. The supply of properties exceeds demand, and real estate prices, as measured by the real estate price index, were down almost 10 percent y/y in March. We expect inflation to ease to 1.5 percent in 2017 before rising to 3 percent next year

on slowly rebounding international food prices and improving economic growth. Of course, were the diplomatic dispute to drag on for several months, with the supply of food and goods entering Qatar either affected or subjected to costlier reroutes, then the impact on consumer prices could be profound.

### **Fiscal restraint to continue**

Qatar recorded its second consecutive fiscal deficit in 2016, at -9 percent of GDP. Lower oil and gas revenues as a result of the oil price downturn have significantly affected the gov-

ernment's finances. In response, the authorities embarked on fiscal consolidation, cutting current expenditures through freezes in public sector pay, reductions in expatriate employees and in the number of ministries. Fuel and utility subsidies were cut, and non-essential infrastructure scaled back, as in other GCC states. This year should see further fiscal restraint, but with spending targeted to a greater extent at infrastructure projects, many of which need to be completed in time for the FIFA World Cup in 2022. The deficit is expected to narrow to -5.1 percent of GDP in 2017 and to -3.5 percent of GDP in 2018, thanks largely to an expected

improvement in energy prices.

Qatar sold more than \$17 billion in bonds and sukuk in 2016, \$14.5 billion of which was raised from international investors. This included a \$9.0 billion triple-tranche USD-denominated international bond last May. Consequently, central government debt (gross) increased significantly in 2016 to 67.2 percent of GDP from 44.6 percent in 2015. Recourse to the debt markets has helped Qatar's finances and injected much-needed liquidity into the banking system.

Increasing debt issuance has not stemmed the decline in the country's international reserves, however, which fell to \$34.4 billion in April, a y/y decline of 3.6 percent. April's figure also represents a fall of \$11.6 billion, or 25 percent, from the country's all-time high reserve level of \$46 billion in November 2014. Import cover is still around 6.6 months, however, which is more than twice the 3 months recommended

by the IMF for fixed exchange-rate regimes.

### **Credit growth**

In 2016, total credit growth rebounded from the single digit lows of early 2015 to come in at a robust 12.1 percent, driven by public sector lending. By the end of April, credit growth was ranging around 9 percent y/y, with public and private sector lending growth at 15.9 percent y/y and 5.1 percent y/y, respectively. Private credit growth is below where it needs to be to get the private sector fully engaged in the country's development plan. Real estate lending is especially lackluster, while demand from industry, contractors and retail consumers remains soft.

### **Deposit growth**

Meanwhile, the banking system has witnessed double-digit deposit growth since last December as oil prices firmed over that period. Total deposits rose by 16.4 percent y/y by the end of April. Both public and private sector deposits have led the way, rising by 0.3 percent y/y and 12.1 percent y/y, respectively. Meanwhile, non-resident deposits, though still increasing at the rate of 56 percent y/y, are not doubling as they were last year.

The improvement in liquidity is reflected in the banking sector's loan-to-deposit ratio (LDR). which has fallen since the start of the year as deposit growth has outpaced credit growth. As of April, it stood at 111.6 percent, having been as high as 119.9 percent in February 2016. The decline in government deposits (-11.1 percent) last year and anemic private deposit growth (0.9 percent) hastened commercial banks reliance on foreign funds and led to an increase in overseas liabilities. Net foreign liabilities reached QR 182.5 billion (\$50.1 billion) in April, up 28 percent y/y. Almost all of the liabilities are non-resident deposits, interbank funds and debt securities. They are also largely short-term in nature i.e. less than 12 months.

Most of the funds raised from overseas have been directed towards local lending, a significant portion of which is financing for the government's infrastructure projects, which tend to be long term. This large foreign currency mismatch plus the extent of the banking system's reliance on foreign funds-38 percent of total bank liabilities and 167 percent of foreign assets as of April-are part of the reason that Qatar found its long term sovereign rating lowered. S&P cut it by one notch to AA- recently, following the country's diplomatic isolation by Saudi Arabia and its other neighbors.

All its ratings (including the country's four largest banks) were placed on negative credit watch, a move that was also echoed by Fitch. The key concern is the potential for outflows of external funds should the crisis continue unresolved. The UAE central bank, for example, is reportedly already preparing instructions for UAE entities to unwind their exposure to Qatar, while SAMA, the Saudi central bank, has told banks not to process Qatari riyal-denominated payments and to limit exposure to Qatar.

And while Qatari banks' exposure to GCCsourced funds is no more than 8 percent of total foreign liabilities (QR 75 billion or \$26 billion), the potential for non-GCC funds to depart in the event of a crisis escalation is acute; foreign entities may decide that exposure to Qatar is just not worth the risk. Recognizing this, Qatari banks are reportedly raising their deposit rates in response by as much as 100 bps over LIBOR.

This compares with an average differential of 20 bps before the crisis. Markets moved immediately to re-price Qatari risk, with borrowing costs up, spreads widening and equities falling. The impact on the markets has been pronounced, with strong repricing of Qatari risk: borrowing costs have already spiked, with interbank rates rising 29 bps to 2.21 percent over the last week; CDS spreads have widened from 58 bps before the crisis to 92.5 bps as of 12 June; yields on Qatari bonds (2021) are up 35 bps; and the QE index, the main equities index, is down 7 percent ytd at 9,135, having been in positive territory in early June.

The riyal is also under pressure in the forwards market, with speculation increasing that a total financial boycott by Qatar's neighbors would lead to financial outflows and tighter credit conditions and force the Qataris to abandon the US dollar peg. We view this as highly unlikely, however. The authorities are steadfast in their commitment to the peg with more than enough resources to defend it.

The authorities, with \$335 billion in sovereign wealth fund assets with the Qatar Investment Authority (QIA), as well as \$34 billion in central bank international reserves, would have ample financial resources to weather a financial dislocation of this sort (asset coverage of Qatari banks' GCC exposure would stand at 14 times). Furthermore, the political and economic costs of a de-peg would dwarf any potential benefit to Qatar.

### GLOBAL GROWTH STEADY, GCC REMAINS RESILIENT

### KAMCO REPORT ON IMF WORLD ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

**KUWAIT:** Global growth forecasts left unchanged ascribed to the expected impact of lower oil profrom April-17 expectations: IMF left its global growth estimates for 2017 and 2018 unchanged at 3.5 percent and 3.6 percent respectively, in its World Economic Outlook (WEO) update released in July 2017. However, contribution to global growth from constituents at the country level was different, as US growth was brought down to 2.1 percent for both 2017 (-20bps ) and 2018 (-40bps), while Japan and Euro Area growth were pushed up. Emerging Economies growth in 2017 higher than Apr-17 expectations: Regionally, the growth of Advanced Economies was kept stable in 2017, but was lowered by 10 bps for 2018 (1.9 percent).

The downgrade was driven by negative revisions in US growth, despite positive revision in Euro countries such as France, Germany, Italy and Spain, where Q1-17 growth surprised positively. Emerging Economies continued to see positive revisions in growth, as 2017 growth (4.6 percent) was revised higher driven by growth of commodity importers, while early signs of improvement are starting to emerge as well from large commodity exporters. Saudi Arabia's growth slashed by 160 bps for 2017: Saudi Arabia's Real GDP growth for 2017 and 2018 are projected to be lower at 0.1 percent (-30bps) and 1.1 percent (-20 bps) respectively, than earlier expected. These downward revisions were mainly

duction, following the agreement to extend production cuts until Mar-2018, as agreed in the OPEC meet earlier in 2017.

Oil production cuts, firming global growth should keep GCC fiscal initiatives going: Despite the IMF reiterating that global growth is stabilizing, oversupply concerns in oil markets and oil inventory overhang have led to oil prices dropping below \$ 50/b. For GCC countries, lower prices and production cuts should be counterproductive to oil-GDP forecasts, which should witness downward revisions similar to Saudi Arabia, if oil prices do not recover. Nevertheless, KAMCO Research believes that more firming of global growth would stabilize oil prices and the current backdrop of low oil prices and stable global growth should further set the precedent for further fiscal and revenue consolidation measures for GCC countries.

### Non-oil economy in GCC

IMF forecasts average oil prices to increase by \$9.1/b in 2017, from an average of \$42.8/b achieved over 2016 to \$51.9/b. Further, a marginal increase to \$52.0/b is forecasted for 2018. The recent agreement in May-17 to extend production cuts until Mar-18 should result in lower oil revenues for GCC countries for 2017. Nevertheless, there has been improvements seen in the non-oil sectors of Saudi Arabia and UAE with PMI numbers published by Emirates NBD showing sharp increases in output and other indicators. KAMCO Research expects this trend to continue if global growth is expected to stabilize further, as policy initiatives should lead to more improvement in key indicators relating to the non-oil economy.

The incremental impact of newer challenges seem to be diminishing in our view, as the regions seems focused on fiscal consolidation and bolstering revenue side initiatives. US growth was revised down from 2.3 percent to 2.1 percent in 2017, while 2018 growth was revised down more from 2.5 percent to 2.1 percent, which pulled down GDP of Advanced Economies by 0.1 percent. US growth for 2017 was reduced primarily due to a weak Q1-17, while the revision for 2018 was mostly ascribed to the expectation of a less expansionary fiscal policy. UK growth was also brought down for 2017 by 30 bps to 1.7 percent, due to weaker than expected economic activity in Q1-17. On the other hand, Euro area growth picked up the slack in growth, and estimates was pushed up both for 2017 (+20bps) and 2018 (+10bps). Key drivers for the upgrade are, stronger momentum in domestic demand and positive growth revisions to high frequency indicators for Q2-17, as per the IMF. Japan is also expected to grow faster than prior expectations, as private con-

sumption, investment, and exports drove Q1-17 growth and similar indicators look promising for Q2-17 as well. CPI forecasts for Advanced Economies were revised lower by 10bps each for 2017 and 2018 and are slightly under 2 percent per annum.

### **Mixed revision in forecasts**

Emerging and developing economies are forecasted to see a sustained growth in activity, with GDP growth rising to 4.6 percent in 2017 (+10bps) and 4.8 percent in 2018. India and China continue to dominate as the fastest growing large economies in the region.

China's GDP growth was revised upwards by 10bps and 20bps respectively to average 6.7 percent per annum over 2017 and 2018. The upgrade reflects stronger than expected growth that came in Q1-17 underpinned by previous policy easing and supply-side reforms, as per the IMF. In Emerging and Developing Europe, growth is forecasted to be faster in 2017 (+50 bps), driven by higher growth from Turkey, where exports recovered strongly in Q4-16 and Q1-17. IMF expects external demand to be stronger with improved prospects for Euro area trading partners. MENAP (Middle East, North Africa and Pakistan) growth was retained for 2017, but brought down by 10 bps for 2018, likely due to the reduction in growth of Saudi Arabia for the year, and risks of lower oil prices on the GCC region.

Strength among commodity firms and banking stocks, as well as a string of solid corporate results, boosted bourses as the euro, the pound and main Scandinavian currencies took advantage of the soft dollar. The US currency was stuck at its lowest since June 2016 after a near 4 percent drop over the last month and more than 8 percent fall this year.

"We may see some consolidation here from the dollar but fundamentally our bearish view on it remains," UniCredit Global Head of FX Strategy Vasileios Gkionakis said.

"What the Fed says tomorrow is the million dollar question... but the risk is that they sound a bit more cautious after the fourth consecutive downside surprise in inflation."

Against the yen, the dollar did manage to put up a bit of fight, edging up to 111.380 yen having slipped as low as 110.625 yen - its lowest since mid-June - the previous day.

The yen had yielded as two new Bank of Japan policymakers said it would be premature to even talk about ending its massive monetary stimulus. Analysts see the dollar under 110 yen though, if the Fed shows any serious concern this week. The political troubles of President Donald Trump's White House continue to mount too, with investigations into his pre-election links to Russia deepening.

Trump blasted the probes again in a pair of early morning tweets aimed at his attorney general. There is also growing anxiety about the United States hitting another debt ceiling in October with few options to potentially offset that. The debt ceiling issue has started to cause problems at Treasury bill auctions and the three-month T-bill yield rose above the 6month equivalent late Monday to account for the outside risk of a technical default.

### **EURO-PHORIC**

The euro got a boost early on as German business morale hit a new high, with firms "euphoric" according to the Munich-based Ifo economic institute that compiles the data from 7,000 of them in Europe's largest econoeuro's recent sharp rise that German business was experienced in managing the impact of exchange rate moves.

The IMF also was expected to give an upbeat eurozone report later. Greek government borrowing costs hovered near their lowest level since 2010, meanwhile, as the country sold its first longer-dated bond in three years at 4.625 pct. Some five years since European Central Bank Mario Draghi pledged to do "whatever it takes" to preserve the euro, the debt sale by Greece was the clearest sign yet of the bloc's recovery from its crippling debt crisis.

It spurred demand for other low-rated debt, with bonds of Portugal and Spain outperforming those in powerhouse Germany and the gap between Italian and German 10year yields dropping to its smallest since December 2016.

"Confidence in Greece is really coming back, but we need to continue the good work. We need to be on the bicycle, and to keep on pedalling," Europe's economics commissioner, Pierre Moscovici, said.

In commodities, oil prices extended their recovery on a pledge by leading OPEC producer Saudi Arabia to cut exports in August to help reduce the global crude glut. Halliburton Co's executive chairman also said the US shale drilling boom would probably ease next year. US crude jumped 1.6 percent to \$47 a barrel, after closing up 1.25 percent on Monday. Global benchmark Brent added 1.55 percent to \$49.35, extending Monday's 1.1 percent rise.

# KNOW WHERE TO FIND YOUR DIGITAL RISK

pproximately 250 years ago Samuel Johnson said, "The next best thing to knowing something is, knowing where to find it."This is quite a fitting quote from the author of

A Dictionary of the English Language and equally fitting today when it comes to understanding your digital risk. There's a great deal of intelligence organizations can find on the deep and dark web. Credit card numbers, bank account information, patient information and intellectual property are widely known to be for sale on forums. Now some of the intelligence is more eye opening. We're seeing W-2 forms, and employee credentials available, making any organization ripe for tax fraud or account takeover, respectively.

One of the most popular marketplaces on the dark web for such information is AlphaBay. Not only is information related to a company's assets available, but information about new techniques to compromise targets is for sale as well. One of the latest is a tool to bypass SMS account verification, making multi-factor authentication that relies on SMS vulnerable. On such forums you can also find configuration files for credential stuffing tools, like Sentry MBA, that are created for account takeover of specific companies.

There are dozens of marketplaces on the dark web and competition for business is steep. In fact, some less popular marketplaces offer botnets devised to spam AlphaBay users with advertisements or special promotions in an attempt to entice them to switch forums. Not all dark web sources are as readily accessible as AlphaBay, of course. Some require human analyst expertise to also gain access to closed sources to get the most relevant view of the risks.

But for all the notoriety of these marketplaces, it is also important to remember that criminal activity isn't limited to the dark web, particularly given the fact that some countries don't extradite cybercriminals. With minimal consequences, bad actors have no incentive to hide. As a result, cybercrime is an Internet-wide problem, almost equally present on the deep and open web.Deer.io is a prime example. This all-in-one outsourced online shop provides hosting, design (based on WordPress-like templates) and a payment

solution. Additional items for sale on the marketplace include:

Bot-registered social media accounts (usually sold in bulk), typically with the intent of supporting social media spam and artificially increasing the popularity of other accounts/posts.

Stolen, legitimate social media accounts, which are advertised in small quantity but at higher prices compared to bot-registered accounts.

"Coupons" to services that artificially increase the popularity of social media

accounts or posts.
Stolen accounts from other services

including banks, payment, and gift and loyalty cards.

Dedicated servers and domain names. The point is that criminal forums exist everywhere so focusing only on the dark web won't give you a comprehensive view of your digital risk. Furthermore, it isn't enough to simply detect mentions of company assets and concerns. You need context behind the information you see posted to have a better understanding of the actual risk to your organization. This requires a combination of technology and

Automated collection technology can provide visibility into incidents with context, as they happen, wherever they happen - across the open, deep and dark web. For example, being able to see previous posts by other users on the marketplace on the same thread or post can provide a deeper understanding of how your company, employees or customers may be impacted. It can also provide an overview of the user in question, with their name, data joined, activity levels and reputation.

Data scientists and intelligence experts are able to gain access to some closed sources that collection technology alone can't penetrate and they need to be involved in qualifying the data collected. With enhanced analytic capabilities and additional context they can help determine the potential impact to the organization, a possible timeline of events, and recommended action.

A comprehensive assessment of your digital risk starts with knowing where to find it. With an approach that combines technology and human experts looking across the open, deep and dark web, you can understand not only where and when you are mentioned online, but also why, by whom and the likely impact to your organization. This breadth and depth of coverage is essential to protect against threats associated with forums and marketplaces and, ultimately, to formulate a successful digital risk management strategy.

# IN GOOGLE VS. THE EU, A \$2.7B FINE COULD JUST BE THE START

SAN FRANCISCO: Google's parent company Alphabet can easily afford the \$2.7 billion write-down it's taking to cover a big antitrust fine in Europe. But it might find it harder to shrug off the rest of the European regulatory assault that's headed its way. In June, a European Commission ruling slapped down Google for abusing its market dominance in search by unfairly directing visitors to its comparison shopping service, Google Shopping, to the detriment of its rivals.

The regulators not only imposed a huge fine, they also insisted that Google change the way it provides search results in Europe. Alphabet is still mulling an appeal of that



ruling, which could take years to get through the European Court of Justice. And that case is only the first of several such investigations that have embroiled Google across the Atlantic, a situation that raises uncertainty about its ability to operate freely on the continent going forward.

### Why Europe is upset

After a seven-year antitrust probe, the European Commission concluded that Google stifles the ability of rivals like Yelp to compete. That's a different standard than in the US, where regulators tend to step in only when consumer prices go up due to monopolistic power. Europe's top antitrust regulator, Margrethe Vestager, said Google "denied other companies the chance to compete on the merits." Google says it's giving consumers what they want: product listings with pictures and prices, saving them the trouble of repeating a search on

another site. In two other cases, the commission charges Google with allegedly forcing its Android smartphone partners to favor Google's apps and limiting the way its ad-partner websites can display search ads from Google rivals. An Alphabet spokeswoman said Monday the company had nothing to say on the matter beyond its blog response to the fine last month, in which it painted itself as an underdog in product search compared to Amazon.

### How much Google could hurt

It's unclear how constraints on its behavior could affect it, but 33 percent of Alphabet's revenue - roughly \$8.5 billion in the latest quarter - came from the region it calls Europe, the Middle East and Africa. Beyond the fine, Alphabet faces a penalty of up to 5 percent of its average daily turnover if it doesn't give equal treatment to rival comparison shopping services in Europe by late September. It's up to Google to figure out how to do so.

"These things tend to hobble a company's behavior even if there isn't a decision," says Jonathan Taplin, a former professor at University of Southern California and author of "Move Fast and Break Things: How Google, Facebook and Amazon Have Cornered Culture and Undermined Democracy." "I don't think it's the end, I think it's the beginning." Google's previous offers to the commission to change its search results were rejected. That's why it's confusing trying to predict what a solution would look like, says Mark Ballard, head of research for Merkle, an ad agency that represents Gap, Crate&Barrel and other big online ad spenders.

On Monday, Alphabet Inc. reported second-quarter earnings of \$3.52 billion, down 28 percent from \$4.88 billion a year earlier; that figure includes the effect of the \$2.7 billion European fine. Adjusted earnings were \$8.90 per share, below the \$10.26 analysts were expecting, according to FactSet. Revenues rose 19 percent to \$20.9 billion after subtracting commissions it paid out, right on par with expectations. Alphabet shares dropped more than 3 percent in after-hours trading, to \$966.

### MICROSOFT PAINT BRUSHED ASIDE

**SAN FRANCISCO:** Microsoft on Monday announced the end of days for its pioneering Paint application as it focuses on software for 3-D drawing.

Paint drawing and image processing software that made its debut in 1985 with the Windows operating system was among the applications listed as "removed or deprecated" in a Windows 10 Fall Creators Update set for release lat-

er this year. Features or functions on the list "are not in active development and might be removed in future releases," according to the US technology company. For decades, Paint was among applications installed by default on Windowspowered personal computers and drew a strong following. Fans of the application will be able to take solace in a Paint 3-D version launched early this year.— AFP

## NOT SQUIDDING AROUND

platoon 2 is easy to love. It's colorful and quirky and unafraid to be different, and it's consistently a blast to play. As far as shooters go, its unique movement mechanics stand out and make each match exciting. And while the logistics of its multiplayer aren't perfect, Splatoon 2 is a vibrant and exuberant sequel with enough fresh additions and changes to set it apart from the original.

Like the first game, Splatoon 2 stars human-squid hybrids called Inklings. Their world is bright and filled with nautical puns both spoken and implied, and even just walking around and picking out new clothes is delightful. The shoe store is called Shella Fresh, for example, and cute fish-themed decor peppers the hub area. That extends to the game play, of course; your weapons shoot (or sometimes fling) ink, and you can instantly change into your squid form and swim through ink puddles to reload.

Swimming also has a stealth element to it, since you're harder to see and faster, and therefore better equipped for surprise attacks. You can also ink walls and swim up them in squid form, which adds to your verticality in matches. In the standard multiplayer mode Turf War, you're tasked with inking more of the map than your opponents while also "splatting" them to limit their progress.

Multiplayer is undoubtedly the main draw of Splatoon 2, but both new and returning players should absolutely try the new-and-improved single player mode before jumping into any matches. Unlike in the first game, where you could only use the standard Splattershot gun in the campaign, Splatoon 2's serves as a fantastic introduction to all the basic weapon types you'll have access to-and it's much more robust, with collectibles that require a sharp eye to find and creative platforming challenges that really showcase how unique Splatoon 2's movement is for the shooter genre.

And while it starts out a bit basic, each level builds on the last and requires clever application of your knowledge to complete. Grinding on rails while shooting targets, then switching to your squid form and successfully landing a tricky jump is satisfying not just because it's fun and

cool but because it really feels like you've mastered Splatoon 2's new mechanics.

Unfortunately, not all of the single player campaign's lessons make it into the multiplayer. Most notably, rail grinding, which is the standout from single player, isn't possible on Moray Towers' rails. That in particular feels like a missed opportunity, especially since that map is returning from the first game. However, getting to use a wide variety of weapons in single player makes the transition to multiplayer easier, and subtle tweaks to weapons and gear, like faster movement with the roller, add a layer of new strategy for veteran players. On top of that, the majority of the maps are new, and favorites include Inkblot Art Academy and The Reef, both of which have several vertical levels that result in intense struggles for control of the higher ground.

The only multiplayer mode for non-ranked matches is Turf War, which is consistently so much fun that only having one casual mode isn't really a problem. Covering the most ground with your ink is a simple enough concept, but skillful movement, well-timed inking, and the right strategy for your weapon all work together to give each match more depth. There are some wrinkles with the logistics of these regular battles: there's no way to change your weapon once you're in a lobby, so you're stuck with whatever team composition you get, and you can't guarantee you'll be on the same team as any friends who join your lobby.

But, as the most laid-back of the multiplayer options, Turf Wars' quick games and random team assignments make it easy to jump in and out and have fun without too much pressure. It might be frustrating when your team of random doesn't seem to know what they're doing, but the fast-paced struggle to cover turf with your team's ink is as exhilarating as ever.

Ranked battles return with Tower Control, Rainmaker, and Splat Zones. Each mode is similar to game types you might be familiar with in other team shooters; Tower Control consists of escorting a tower to a goal, Rainmaker is like reverse capture the flag, and Splat Zones requires you to "control" specific areas for a certain amount of time by covering them with your team's ink.

Unfortunately, the lobbies for ranked matches haven't been populated enough for us to play

them ahead of launch, but based on our experience with the first game, we can expect these modes to work essentially the same way. Splatoon's ink mechanics make these modes feel different from other games, and the focus on specific objectives is great for competitive players who want something more than the informal structure of Turf War.

There's also a new co-op mode called Salmon Run that lets you play alongside one to three friends in a horde environment. It's surprisingly challenging and requires more strategy and finesse than Turf War by far. Even on lower difficulties, my groups struggled against mini bosses that require specific strategies to take outthey're less threatening than the single-player bosses but hard to deal with in high volumes.

Successfully clearing the waves was satisfying knowing that we had to have worked well as a team in order to survive. In addition to the updated single-player campaign, this is another mode that shows off what's so great about Splatoon 2's unique game play in ways that PvP multiplayer doesn't.

The biggest problems with the original Splatoon's multiplayer were limited matchmaking and a lack of voice chat, which made team strategy extremely cumbersome and difficult. While regular battles still lack shooter matchmaking mainstays like parties, there's a new mode called League Battle that lets you group up with either one or three other friends and play together in a more competitive environment. League battles include the same modes as ranked but don't affect your solo rank, which is a great option if your skills aren't quite in line with your friends'. That said, voice chat is still a problem-you have to use a phone app to communicate, which is inelegant at best and ridiculous for a modern team-based game. There's no good reason it couldn't have been included in-game.

At first glance, Splatoon 2 seems very similar to the first game. But all the small changes, and even the bigger ones in single player and League Battles, make for a fresh take on the already unique shooter. If you played a lot of the original, the sequel has enough to keep you coming back, and if you're new to the game, it's a fantastic place to jump in.

### HOSPITALS OVERWHELMED AS SRI LANKA DENGUE TOLL NEARS 300

t was intensifying its war on dengue fever, with schools to shut across the island to help curb the unprecedented outbreak of the mosquito-borne virus that has claimed nearly 300 lives. The Red Cross also announced it was scaling up its emergency response to the country's worst-ever outbreak of the disease as the number of dengue cases topped 100,000. That figure is nearly double the previous year, with doctors warning hospitals were beyond capacity as medics struggled to treat a new strain of the disease.

The education ministry said schools would shut from Friday for four days as tens of thousands of volunteers join government officials and soldiers in targeting mosquito breeding grounds. "Instructions have gone out to all schools today to coordinate with local authorities and look for any mosquito breeding areas in their immediate neighborhood," a ministry official said. Troops have already been spreading out across the island to help local councils drain pools of stagnant water to ensure mosquito larvae have nowhere to flourish.

Official figures show 290 people have died so far this year from dengue fever, nearly four times the fatalities recorded in

all of 2016. The number of cases has soared to above 105,000, a sharp jump from the 55,150 recorded last year. About half those cases were reported from the island's west, including the capital Colombo. "One reason for the dramatic rise in cases is that the virus currently spreading has evolved and people lack the immunity to fight off the new strain," Dr Novil Wijesekara, head of health at the Sri Lanka Red Cross, said in a statement.

The humanitarian organization, which has increased its budget by \$300,000 to cope with the outbreak, said infected patients were "streaming into overcrowded hospitals that are stretched beyond capacity and struggling to cope". Last week Australia said it was donating \$1.2 million to manage patients and help with research to contain the spread of the virus. Humid monsoon weather, stagnant water from recent flooding and mounting piles of rotting garbage in Colombo have created perfect conditions for the rapid spread of mosguitoes. Authorities have blamed a waste management crisis in the capital for the unusually large number of infections. Sri Lanka's main rubbish tip collapsed in April, crushing dozens of homes and killing 32 people.—AFP

# LOVE HOTELS TARGETED TO FIGHT HIV AMONG CAMEROON'S TEENS

79,771 CHILDREN, YOUTH HIV-POSITIVE IN CAMEROON

**GUIDER, Cameroon:** The two big maps show the districts of the northern Cameroonian town of Guider along with its brothels, nightclubs and other seedy spots to identify places from where AIDS could spread among adolescents. Cameroon, a country of 23 million that hugs Africa's Gulf of Guinea, has one of the highest HIV/AIDS prevalence rates in the world. "The maps highlight the high-risk zones for transmission," said Boris Mbaho Tchaptchet, 21, speaking at a local youth club. "We located the love hotels, the video clubs, the cabarets, the underground meeting places before putting into place an action and prevention plan in our community" he said

The club in Guider was one of those selected for the "All In! End Aids among Adolescents" project launched in August 2015 with the backing of the UN children's agency UNICEF. According to official figures, 79,771 children and adolescents are HIV-positive, but experts say it is much higher. "This platform brings together all the interventions fighting HIV in the country targeting young people," said Jules Ngwa Edielle, who runs the HIV prevention in Cameroon's youth and civic education ministry. It ropes in local administrative, political and religious authorities to fight the disease.



With his colleagues, 21-year-old Bouba Saliou was trained as a peer-group educator in his neighborhood. "My role is to talk with other young people, ask them questions to understand their situation and to encourage them to get tested," he explained. But broaching the delicate issue is not without its pitfalls. "Some people react saying, 'You think I'm sick? Have you ever seen me having sexual relations?' "Other simply refuse, saying that they are confident about their status. But I try to convince anyway," he added with smile.

Saliou cites the case of a 17-year-old who found out he was HIV-positive because of his intervention. "He was very angry at me when he got the results," he recalled. "But today we talk regularly and he tells he is following his treatment regularly." This community-based

approach is essential if Cameroon is to attain the 90-90-90 target set by the UNAIDS, which Cameroon signed up to back in 2015. The aim is to get to the point where 90 percent of those who are HIV-positive know about their condition; where 90 percent of those who know are on retroviral treatment; and where 90 percent of those receiving that treatment achieve viral suppression.

The hope is to be able to wipe out the virus by 2030. Therese Nduwimana, who runs UNICEF Cameroon's HIV unit, said the program had proved its worth in the north of the country with the No Limit for Women Project (Nolfowop). "With a budget of just \$40,000 a year the results have been spectacular," she said. "In just months, the number of HIV-positive children identified has been multiplied by four," she said. However, one of the problems is an acute shortage of medical staff. The hospital in Garoua, which

serves an area with 2.7 million people, only has one pediatrist and one gynecologist.

### Door-to-door campaigns

A group of around 30 women were gathered at one of the town's health centers, waiting to be tested about their HIV status. The result is announced almost immediately. "Our volunteers have gone door to door to encourage every pregnant woman to get tested," said Odette Etame, who heads the Nolfowop project. Other mothers acting as mentors then made home visits to physically accompany HIV-positive women and their children for anti-retroviral treatment, she added. This was one way to reach people who would otherwise be lost from view, she said. Cameroon had a 5.75-percent HIV prevalence rate for pregnant women in 2016, making it one of the 10 countries responsible for 75 percent of new pediatric infections worldwide.—AFP

# TRUMP PRESSURES REPUBLICANS TO REPEAL, WARNS OBAMACARE IS DEATH

washington: US President Donald Trump strongly warned Republicans on Monday that they must pass health care reform, taking his party to task and bluntly declaring that "Obamacare is death." With the effort to repeal and replace the health care law of Trump's predecessor floundering in Congress, the Senate prepared to vote Tuesday on whether to begin debate on the latest Republican plan. Several measures have been considered but then collapsed in recent weeks. The latest is a bid to dismantle the 2010 Affordable Care Act, but delay the actual implementation of the repeal to allow time for a viable replacement to be crafted.

Senate Republican leaders acknowledge they do not know whether there is sufficient support to open debate on the new plan, a sign of Republican division about the impact such reforms might have on millions of American families. With less than three weeks before the Senate is to leave Washington for its already-delayed summer recess, Trump took to his bully pulpit and demanded his party get in line. "Any senator that votes against starting debate is telling America that you are fine with the Obamacare nightmare," Trump said at the White House, where several "victims" of Obamacare stood as a backdrop to his remarks. "Obamacare is death," Trump added. "It's

gone. And now it's up to us to get great health care for the American people."Trump has repeatedly grilled fellow Republicans for not following through on their-and his-campaign pledge to repeal and replace Obamacare, something he said he aimed to do immediately once in office in January. "Over and over again they said repeal and replace. And for Senate Republicans, this is their chance to keep their promise."

Republicans hold 52 of the Senate's 100 seats. With all Democrats opposed, Trump can afford just two defectors. But with Senator John McCain convalescing in Arizona following a brain cancer diagnosis, that magic number is down to one. As of last week, three Republican holdouts said they will vote no on Tuesday's so-called motion to proceed, which opens debate on the legislation. Trump went to one of their home states Monday, where he was to personally lobby Senator Shelley Moore Capito as the two attended a Boy Scouts convention in Beaver, West Virginia.

### Repercussions

Several other Republicans have also expressed concerns, but have not announced how they will vote. "I think until the vote is actually on the floor of the Senate, some people may not tell you what they're actually

going to do," Senate Republican John Barrasso told CBS talk show "Face the Nation" on Sunday. Once the repeal-only bill is on the floor, it could be amended "in various ways," Barrasso said, including changing it to a repeal-and-replace bill. Forecasts by the non-partisan Congressional Budget Office on various health reform bills have predicted that millions of Americans would lose health care if the measures become law.

In the case of a bill that repeals Obamacare and provides no replacement, 32 million more people would be uninsured by 2026 as compared to current law, CBO forecast. Some Republicans have expressed concern with how legislation would impact Medicaid, the health insurance program for the poor and the disabled. The latest repeal-and-replace bill would roll back an expansion of Medicaid and slash its federal funding. It would also end the mandate that most individuals have health insurance, and allow states to let insurance companies offer bare-bones plans not allowed under current law. Despite the concerns voiced by some Republicans-and several outside groups-Trump issued an ominous threat. "If Republicans don't Repeal and Replace the disastrous ObamaCare, the repercussions will be far greater than any of them understand!" he tweeted. —AFP





### THE KILLERS: THE STROKES WERE ALWAYS ABOVE US

■he Killers always thought The Strokes were "so much more above" them. Drummer Ronnie Vannucci Jr has admitted the group didn't put themselves in the same class as their rival band, whose guitarist Nick Valensi recently admitted they used to think their songs were much better than Brandon Flowers' group's tunes. Ronnie told NME magazine: "I certainly didn't, and I don't think anybody in the band really would even put ourselves in the same boat. "We always thought those guys were so much more above us. It's kind of flattering just to hear them talking about our band - even now. "Especially The Strokes. They're one of the baddest rock bands out there." Nick recently revealed his band used to wonder why everyone was listening to some of The Killers' tracks, such as their 2004 hit 'Mr Brightside', more than their own tunes. In an excerpt of book 'Meet Me in the Bathroom: Rebirth and Rock and Roll in New York City 2001-2011' by journalist Lizzy Goodman, he says: "We had conversations that went along the lines of 'Gosh, I think our songs are better than 'Mr Brightside' by the Killers, but how come that's the one everyone is listening to?' "They did it a different

way. They recorded it in a different way. They promoted it in a different way. We could be that big." Frontman Brandon recently admitted he thought The Strokes' debut album 'Is This It' was better than The Killers' first record, 'Hot Fuss', When asked if 'Hot Fuss' was worthy of being named one of the best debut albums in the last 30 years, he replied: "I will say it's one of them. If you ask me, The Strokes' debut is better. Guns N' Roses's debut is better. "But I do think we're up there and I'm proud of it."

was Spanish when he first heard ■his vocals. The 'X Factor' winner recently worked with the hunk on a remix of his smash hit 'S'beme La Radio' alongside Sean Paul - who features on the original - but, although he was born and raised in Bromley, East London, his accent was convincing. Speaking to the Daily Star newspaper, Enrique said: "When I heard Matt sing in Spanish it's crazy. You wouldn't know he was English. He doesn't have an accent. You can tell when he was singing he has that Spanish in him." While Matt has kept a relatively low profile since he won the show, Enrique couldn't wait to work with him after he watched him storm to victory on the program. He explained: "I knew who he was because of 'X Factor' of course. I watch a lot of those shows. We thought it would be cool. He has his fan base. "What I normally like to do in these collaborations is just try it out.

Record producer Don Gilmore, who worked on Linkin Park's 2000 debut album 'Hybrid Theory', insists the frontman - who sadly took his own life last week aged 41 - was a "dream come true" to work alongside and has recalled a particularly powerful recording session with the late star. Speaking about working on the US rockers' debut single 'One Step Closer', he said: "He knocked the walls down in the little fort. When he sang it, he just literally destroyed the whole thing and almost broke the microphone. He was just out of his mind. And the rest is history. "For a record producer he was just a dream come true. He could go to that point that was, like, beyond - it's just crazy how hard he could go with such precision. And even when he sings softly, the precision [was there]. So yeah, he was a super, special guy." Don admitted Chester - who leaves behind six children and wife Talinda -

used to regularly talk about his problems but also laughed a lot and would have the whole crew in hysterics during recording sessions for the band's second studio album 'Meteora'. He added to Billboard: "The thing that is so disturbing about this - and granted, I haven't been in touch with him in a long time - he was a guy who maybe had a few problems, but he would kind of talk about them. "'Oh, this and that. My wife is doing this. Oh, I've got to go do this.' Just normal stuff that we all do. And he liked to laugh, he had an amazing sense of humor. "On 'Meteora', he set up this little ProTools rig out in the lounge and he would write these little funny punk rock songs and record them and bring them in and play them for us. "But I mean, he just was a funny guy, it was awesome. It's just, boy, such a sad, sad thing." Chester's death was officially ruled as suicide by hanging, the LA County Coroner's Office confirmed yesterday.

### Brian McFadden to join Boyzone


rian McFadden is set to join Boyzone for a series of anniversary gigs next year. The 37-year-old singer was hoping that his band Westlife, who split up in 2012, would get back together for a reunion, but it looks like he's finally accepted defeat as he has now agreed to join the rival group for their upcoming 25th anniversary tour. Speaking to The Sun newspaper, Boyzone's Shane Lynch said: "There's a possibility of Brian joining us. He's doing the whole tour on a support but there's no point him hanging around. I'd like to bring him on stage for a couple of songs with the boys." Brian left Westlife in 2004 at the height of the band's success to explore a solo career, before he headed to Australia for a number of television gigs, including being a judge on 'Australia's Got Talent'. But he recently revealed he wanted to reunite with his former band mates Nicky Byrne, Kian Egan, Mark Feehily, and Shane Filan. While the group seemed semi-keen to reform, Louis Walsh - who managed the band - told him it was highly unlikely he would be able to join the foursome. However, Nicky has spoken recently about the prospect of the 'Safe' hitmakers reforming, and confirmed that it was a possibility with their forthcoming 20th anniversary in 2018 being the catalyst. lade Runner' co-writer Hampton Fancher had a sequel script planned a year after the first movie. The original cult film was released in 1982 and now 35 years later Harrison Ford is set to reprise his role as Rick Deckard in 'Blade Runner 2049' but Fancher - who wrote the original and sequel scripts with Sir Ridley Scott admits to having an idea a year after the original was released. Speaking at San Diego Comic Con, Fancher said: "When we finished the first one, within a year we were talking about a second one. Ridley called, I was in New York and I went out to Los Angeles, and we batted stories around. Nothing came of it because of legal problems. I guess, because I was reading in the newspapers, I thought Deckard had come to bad circumstances - he was nowhere - and he got assigned a 'Blade Runner' job in Moscow, and it was all Russian, and cold , and snow ... John le Carre, you know? That's what I was thinking of. I remember telling Ridley that 'Harrison in Moscow!' Just that's a good thing, right? And nothing came of it." The highly-anticipated sequel will see Ford return to the movie and despite famously clashing with franchise creator Sir Ridley Scott, he insists he still has a lot of respect for the veteran filmmaker, but admitted he had a "very different" experience working with Denis. Jared Leto will star in the role of Neander Wallace, but director Denis Villeneuve admitted his first choice was the late David Bowie, but when the iconic singer passed away from cancer in January 2016, he was forced to look for someone else with similar rock star qualities. The film also stars 'La La Land' hunk Ryan Gosling as Officer K and Villeneuve recently admitted the part was written for the actor from the start. Denis said: "The part was written for Ryan right from the start. He was perfect."



"Teenagers for so long have been overlooked," said the 73year-old, still on the road with longtime bandmate Pete Townshend. "Not nearly enough has been done for them." For years, teenage cancer patients were hospitalized on pediatric floors or placed with older patients. After consulting with doctors researching treatments and recovery, Daltrey understood the need for teens to have a place of their own, where they could recover in surroundings more suited to their interests and maturity level. "The light went on in my head with this one," said Daltrey, who first got involved with the Teenage Cancer Trust in 1989. "I was in the Who when I was 18 years old and without the support of this age group - adolescents and young adults - our business wouldn't be there. The music business is built mostly with this age group. It's an easy way for me to say, 'Thank you."

### In 'Detroit,' Bigelow revisits still-burning flames of 1967

Tathryn Bigelow hasn't forgotten the out-of-body experience she felt when she won the best director Academy Award for her 2009 "The Hurt Locker." At that moment, she became the first woman to win the award. None have been nominated since. "The gender inequity that exists in the industry, I thought it would maybe be the beginning of that inequity not being quite so pronounced," said Bigelow in a recent interview. "Sadly, that doesn't seem to be the case. And I don't know why that is. I just don't know. But I sort of feel like on behalf of all the women who might yearn to tell challenging, relevant, topical, entertaining stories -that I was standing there for them. And that emboldened me."

Boldness is not a fleeting quality for Bigelow. Since "The Hurt Locker," she has, with the reporter-turned-screenwriter Mark Boal, continued to craft an ambitious, intrepid kind of cinema that marries visceral big-screen immersion with deeply researched journalism. Their previous collaboration, the Osama bin Laden-hunt thriller "Zero Dark Thirty," proved an unparalleled flashpoint in both Hollywood and Washington, prompting debates over its representation of the role torture played in the manhunt. "I'm the messenger. I didn't invent the message," she said. "I'm just compelled to make these challenging pieces. And I'm compelled by stories that are informational, that tell you what you didn't know going in - that I didn't know going in." Her latest film, "Detroit" is a no-less challenging dive into the violent soul of America, but this time, she's on the home front.

### Fire and fury

The film, also from a script from Boal, is about the Algiers Motel incident, a relatively little-remembered event that took place amid the 1967 Detroit riots - an uprising sparked by a police raid of an after-hours club - and a reaction to a long history of oppression of the city's African-Americans. The riots, among the largest in US history, left 43 dead and led to the deployment of thousands of national guardsman to a Detroit that raged in fire and fury.

"Detroit" seeks to show the historical context and indi-

vidual reality of the riots, which many say should be called a "rebellion." Within the chaos was the particularly heinous act at the Algiers Motel. Three unarmed black males were killed in an encounter with police and nine others (seven of them black) were beaten and terrorized. Three officers were charged with murder, as well as other crimes, but found not guilty. Boal approach Bigelow about making a film about the incident shortly after a St. Louis County grand jury decided not to indict police officer Darren Wilson, whose fatal shooting of Michael Brown prompted the protests in Ferguson, Missouri. The relevance of the tale, Bigelow said, fueled her motivation for making it.

"There was something sadly, tragically contemporaneous about this story," Bigelow said. "How can this conversation happen in a meaningful way, is what I walk away asking. I'm just telling this story in as authentic and truthful and honest a way as we could given the information that is out there." The story for Boal began with Cleveland Larry Reed. During the riots, Reed (played by Algee Smith in the film) was an 18-year-old singer in the Dramatics, an upand-coming Motown group whose concert was canceled that night. He and another bandmate bunkered down at the Algiers, only to find themselves swept into a nightmare. Reed, who met with Boal and later with Smith, never recovered from the ordeal; he gave up professional music, singing instead in church choirs.

### **Everyone stopped**

"In the summer of 2014, I was drawn to this story after meeting Larry Reed and hearing him recount what had happened to him 50 years ago, and then, later on, hearing from other survivors of the Algiers," Boal wrote in an email.

"My idea for the movie was driven from the start by real people, being moved by the fine-grained particulars of what they went through." Smith, a 22-year-old actor from Saginaw, Michigan, described the set as a profoundly emotional one where the cast merely needed to "log onto our social medias for inspiration." "We were shooting a movie about history but it felt like today," he said.

He and other actors playing the terrorized victims weren't given scripts for much of the production so that their reactions of shock and horror were more genuine. "She wanted us to have a tomorrow's-not-promised type of mindset," Smith said. "We just got there and then the first day it was just total chaos. It was: 'Put your hands on the wall.' Screaming. I'm getting light-headed because I'm breathing so hard in between takes. It was emotionally and physically draining every day for those first two weeks. Will Poulter (who plays the ringleader officer) broke down on set. In the middle of a scene, he just started crying. The whole set just stopped. Everyone stopped. Will went outside and I put my arm around him but I just started crying too."

Some may say "Detroit" is a story that ought to have been told by black filmmakers. Bigelow, who has spent her career either ignoring or exploding gender stereotypes, understands such criticism. "Am I the perfect person to tell that story? Absolutely not," Bigelow said. "But I felt honored to tell this story. It's a story that's been out of circulation for 50 years. And if it can encourage a conversation about race in this country, I would find that extremely encouraging and important." Her films, she said, are about creating empathy and, hopefully, dialogue. Earlier this year, she codirected an eight-minute virtual-reality film about park rangers in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, "The Protectors: Walk in the Rangers' Shoes." "Institutionalized racism is at the heart of the piece," Bigelow said of "Detroit." "I think the purpose of art is to agitate for change. But you

can't change anything unless you're aware of it." — AP

### Robots, race cars and weather: Girl Scouts offer new badges

'It's really all about how do we capture that interest in science and technology'

irl Scouts from tiny Daisies to teen Ambassadors may earn 23 new badges focused on science, technology, engineering and math. It's the largest addition of new badges in a decade for Girl Scouts of the USA. The effort takes a progressive approach to STEM and also nudges girls to become citizen scientists using the great outdoors as their laboratory. Among the new badges are those that introduce kindergarten and first graders to the world of robots and engineering. Scouts can learn basic programming and build prototypes to solve everyday problems. Older scouts will have the chance to enhance those skills, learning more about artificial intelligence, algorithms and how to formally present their work.

Other new badges focus on race car and aviation design using kits from GoldieBlox, a girl-focused toy company. The "leave no trace" approach to interacting with the environment and the study of meteorology by learning to predict weather patterns and potential hazards are among activities geared to new outdoors badges. Cayla Hicks, 7, is grateful. She's a Baltimore Brownie who's interested in the "Designing Robots" badge. "I want to be a scientist. I like building things and I like discovering things. Me and my brother - well, I usually ask my brother if he wants to look through my telescope. Usually he says no," Cayla said as she recently demonstrated how to make a "robotic arm" out of sticks and fasteners.

Baby boomer Sylvia Acevedo, the CEO of the scouting group, was just like Cayla as a girl growing up in tiny Las Cruces, New Mexico. "My troop leader looked at me and saw me looking at the stars, and she taught me that there were constellations, she taught me there were systems and patterns to the

stars," Acevedo said in a recent interview. "Because I got my science badge I developed that courage and that confidence to study science and math at a time when girls like me weren't studying science and math. Girls like me, statistically, weren't even finishing high school." Acevedo was one of the first Hispanic students, male or female, to earn a graduate engineering degree from Stanford University. The former tech executive's first job was as a rocket scientist at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in California.

### Vulnerable to a crisis

The new badges, some of which were requested by scouts themselves in a survey, are available starting this week. Next year, another initiative will allow Girl Scouts to earn "Cybersecurity" badges.

One study cited by the scouts showed women remain vastly underrepresented in that industry, holding 11 percent of such jobs globally. Another study, done by the Computing Technology Industry Association, found that 69 percent of women who have not pursued careers in information technology attribute their choice to not knowing what opportunities are available to them.

As for STEM overall, Acevedo said, a lot of girls remain vulnerable to a crisis of confidence in pursuing education and careers in those fields. "A lot of girls haven't made that shift from using technology to, 'You can actually be a programmer," she said. "That you're the one who can make that coding. For a lot of girls, they need to have that hands-on experience so they feel confident." The scouts, which are 1.8 million strong in the US, has offered such opportunities in the past but consider the new badges and related programming a major push. "It's really all about how do we capture that interest in science and technology," Acevedo said. "The other thing is the girls are learning not just how to do a specific skill but also how to think, how to think like an inventor, how to think like a creator, how to think like a maker. Those are the types of things that we want to ignite in the girls."

Jennifer Allenbach, the scouting group's vice president for "girl experience," oversaw development of the new badges. Exposing girls to STEM by second grade is crucial in motivating them to continue, she said. As for the outdoors, the strategy is to move girls forward to dig deeper into such issues as conservation. "Girls had a say in this," she said. "We reached out and asked what they were interested in and this is it." — AP

### Dutch dust off 'painful' Nazi bunkers for tourism and healing

ust behind The Hague's sandy beaches under the dunes lie dozens of Nazi bunkers built during World War II which the Dutch are now dusting off to attract tourists and to help heal lingering scars. Once buried under heaps of sand and rubble, this network of bunkers and tunnels is a remnant of Hitler's "Atlantikwall", a coastal defense stretching 5,000 kilometers (3,125 miles) from northern Norway to southern France. The Hague in particular was seen as a strategic point to be heavily fortified, and the German Nazi dictator ordered the Atlantic Wall defences to be built in 1942 seeking to keep an Allied invasion of Europe at bay.

More than 870 bunkers of different shapes and sizes were constructed of reinforced concrete. Today around 470 of them can still be found in the Dutch capital's dunes and forests, said Jacques Hogendoorn, a volunteer at the Atlantikwall Museum based in the seaside suburb of Scheveningen. "Some have been opened to the public, others are used as a shelter for bats during wintertime," Hogendoorn told

AFP.

"Some bunkers are still being discovered," added Guido Blaauw, a businessman who has bought a bunker at the Clingendael estate where Austrian Nazi boss Arthur Seyss-Inquart-later executed for war crimes-once had his own massive underground shelter. After the war, shortages led to the bunkers being plundered for materials such as wire and wood until the angry Dutch sealed them off. Since 2008,

Hogendoorn and his foundation, with the agreement of local authorities, have carefully restored one 10-room bunker complex in the Scheveningen woods.

Here visitors can experience the damp, cool claustrophobic atmosphere where generators constantly ran in the past to ventilate the underground maze. It is a step back in time with vestiges of an old telephone system and signs that say in German: 'Beware, the enemy is listening'.

### 'Buried it underground'

But the bunkers are a dark reminder of the bitter German occupation of The Netherlands between 1940-45, said Deirdre Schoemaker, spokeswoman of the European Atlantikwall Heritage Foundation. More than 100,000 Hague residents were forcibly removed to make space for the Atlantikwall, which saw thousands of homes, seven schools, three churches and two hospitals flattened. The bunkers were often built using Dutch slave labor and with the collaboration of Dutch companies hoping to profit from the war.

No wonder that when The Hague was finally liberated in early May 1945, its residents buried the bunkers under sand and rubble to put the war behind them. "We have a Dutch expression... which literally means 'buried it under the ground'," Schoemaker told AFP. "That was really the case after the war and for many years, for decades you saw that. It was a painful history," she said. "People just did not talk about it."


### 'Bunker Day'

For decades the bunkers mostly lay dormant, an intriguing playground for local children, while others were used by the Dutch government as high-security command posts during the Cold War. Slowly however in the last decade people's views have changed, Schoemaker said. "There's more and more openness. People are becoming more comfortable about talking about them, even with German tourists," she said. Growing curiosity combined with an understanding of their historic significance led to The Hague's first official "Bunker Day" in 2014. "It's German history, not the best history, but history you have to see in order for it not to happen again," said German tourist

Sebastian Frank, 31, a geriatric nurse from Dresden.
The annual June event has now grown to incorporate bunker visits along the entire Dutch coast as well as Belgium for the first time this year, Schoemaker said. "There is huge interest. At our latest Bunker Day we had more than 10,000 visitors and each of them visited at least three to four bunkers," she said, at an entrance price of six euros (\$6.8) for adults and three euros for children.


### 'Brings back memories'

For many Dutch people who lived through the war, a visit to the bunkers may be the first time they can confront an often repressed past and it "brings back the memories," said Schoemaker. "I think it can be very therapeutic ... It's often a part of their histo-




ry that's been hidden inside them. In this way they can let it out and put it behind them." Bunker owner Blaauw added that "elderly people who witnessed the war and had problems with the bunkers right after the war are now more interested in them." But still many hesitate to be reminded of that time as the "war has defined their whole lives up until today," he said. — AFP



### Road Trip: The Overseas Highway from Key Largo to Key West

he Overseas Highway links Florida's mainland with Key West, and some tourists drive straight through the chain without exploring until they get to the end of the road. Those people are missing a lot to see and do on the 108 miles (173 km) of highway and islands in between. From 33-mile-long (53-km) Key Largo to little Ramrod Key, which is less than 2 miles (3.2 km) wide, the Keys are full of opportunities for adventure for anyone willing to slow down and look around. Here are some possibilities:

### Go snorkeling

Located only 65 miles (104 km) south of Miami on the island of Key Largo, John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park is a good first stop on a road trip to Key West. Extending 3 miles (4.8 km) into the Atlantic Ocean, the park encompasses about 235 square miles (608 square km) of seafloor that includes the only living coral reef in the continental United States and seagrass. Privately owned boats ferrying divers and snorkelers often hover over the reef, but the park and private vendors offer reasonably priced day trips for tourists. Put on a swimming mask and stick your head beneath the water and a new world appears. Brightly colored tropical species like parrotfish and angelfish dart past waving fan coral, along with the occasional barracuda

### Explore a neighborhood

US 1, the official name of the Overseas Highway, makes a long, sweeping curve southward from the mainland toward Key West. There aren't many twists or turns, but there countless side streets that link the highway with waterfront neighborhoods. Go venturing down a few of those lanes. Residential areas that range from opulent to funky are hidden on side streets off the highway. Some houses are oceanfront mansions; the more interesting ones are a lot smaller.

Mobile homes painted all sorts of tropical shades line narrow streets in the upper keys, and residents go out of their way to give them an island feel. You'll see decorations like metal parrots, mounted fish, homemade art and Jimmy Buffett flags most everywhere.

### Kayak a canal

Many of those same neighborhoods are built around narrow canals that were dug of the coral bedrock decades ago to provide easier access to the sea. The best way to see the "wet" side of these spots is by kayak. You'll need a kayak rental shops are plentiful - and a place to put it in the water, like the boat ramp beside the Caribbean Club on Key Largo's Blackwater Sound. That done, start paddling.

Canals leading into neighborhoods are easy to spot along the shore. Head down one and you're instantly surrounded by big boats, many of which hang overhead on davits that keep them suspended above the corrosive saltwater. Tiki huts and outdoor lounging areas line the canals. Look down

into the water and you're likely to see a manatee, the endangered "sea cows" that live in backwaters around the Keys. These massive mammals are protected by federal law, so don't try to feed or pet them. But also don't be surprised if one pokes its head out of the water by your boat.

### Feed a tarpon

Thousands of anglers visit the Florida Keys each year hoping to catch tarpon, a mammoth species of silver-and-green fish that often grows larger than 150 pounds. Tourists also can feed them fish by hand at a few locations. One of the best-known spots for getting an up-close look at tarpon is Robbie's Marina of Islamorada, located at the base of a bridge at Mile Marker 77.

Visitors at Robbie's pay \$2 to enter a dock where a school of the fish hang out, and it's \$3 for a bucket of small fish to feed the tarpon. Grab a dead fish by the tail, hold it close to the water and wait a few seconds - there will be a tarpon grabbing a quick snack in no time. It may sound easy, but just try holding still when a 100-pound fish with a gaping mouth jumps out of the water toward you.

### Count iguanas. Or chickens. Or coconuts

Remember the old backseat game of counting cows to make the time pass? The Florida Keys offers variations. Iguanas are the squirrels of the Keys. The green, long-tailed reptiles are easy to spot soaking up the sun on grassy roadsides, in parking lots, in trees and bushes.

But, chickens? Yep, free-range yard birds are near-constant sight also, strutting around neigh borhoods and businesses. They don't belong to anyone and are best known in Key West. But feral chickens are all over the Keys, and they have been for generations. Look up in the palm trees or down at the ground and you might just see a coconut. If you want to add to the entertainment, find one on the ground in a public area and try to open it. Just remember: It's not that easy, regardless of what that video on YouTube might claim. — AP

# Gilberto Gil daughter becomes healthy food 'guru'

ela Gil may be the youngest daughter of Brazilian singer and politician Gilberto Gil, but she's not riding on her father's musical coat tails. Instead, she has turned her fascination with the "weird" things her dad ate when she was little, such as tofu and seaweed, into her own television show on cooking, "Bela Cozinha." In it, Gil shows how to make a vegetarian version of Brazil's national dish of feijoada (a stew of beans, usually with pork and beef), gnocchi pasta made from yuca, or a pesto sauce from cacao-all showcasing natural ingredients from her country.

"I feel that Brazilians have stopped eating real, home-made food, with salad and vegetables, and instead eat more industrialized food because they are unfairly cheaper," the 29-year-old nutritionist and cook told AFP in her colorful Rio office. With around a million Facebook followers, the youngest of seven children from Gilberto Gil has made a name for herself. She has two restaurants in Rio de Janeiro, three best-selling recipe books, and various branded products, from a line of organic food to a clothing line.

But it's her tropical, healthy cuisine that is best known. In it, she swaps out butter for coconut oil, eggs for linseed, dairy milk for almond milk, and sausages for roast fish. Memes have popped up making fun of her "hippy" tendencies. But in the Gil household, such jabs have never been a problem. When it comes to eating, her father was always a diner apart. From his exile to London in the 1970s, the singer started a macrobiotic diet, back when it was considered eccentric.

### A niche in Brazil

Gilberto Gil, says Bela, never forced his kids to follow suit. But he chided them when they drank too little water, or too much juice, or ate too much sweet foods. Bela started to adopt some of her father's ways at age 15, when yoga start-

ed to influence her lifestyle. At 18, she left to live in New York, where she studied nutrition. She specialized in holistic eating in search of physical, emotional and spiritual balance. Because of her father's practices, "I didn't feel so strange and his example encouraged me to continue in this direction," she said.

While healthy eating is a current evident in Western countries, it's not so prominent in Brazil, where poverty is

once again on the rise even as genetically modified crops and deforestation grow. "Brazil is a country that's really rich, and really poor," Bela said. "Not everybody has the opportunity to choose. My fight is for those who can to give priority to organic products." She has joined an NGO that promotes food for society, and also hosts a radio program on childhood nutrition.

But her tilt towards sustainability doesn't end with food. She also uses her own YouTube channel to inspire other Brazilians to make their own toothpaste with tumeric, or homemade baby food, or alternatives to store-bought sanitary napkins for women. "We're being manipulated a lot by industries pushing us to think that we can only buy toothpaste in the pharmacy, that we should only drink bottled milk, or take certain medicines." "To learn that there are alternatives to all that is something unimaginable for a lot of people," she said.

### Like her father

With her individual style and penchant to teach it, it's no surprise that Gilberto Gil said that she's the daughter who's most like him, and not only in appearance. He and other members of the Gil family pop up in many of her videos, in which almost nothing is kept secret-the one most watched was when she had a natural child birth of her second son in her home's pool. Naturally, she ate the placenta, for its vitamins. Bela says she regrets nothing, and has no right to say what is right or wrong-only what makes her happy. "And I feel happy to have so many followers. The more people in this boat with me, the better," she smiled. — AFP
