

PARIS: Pro-European centrist Emmanuel Macron resoundingly won France's landmark presidential election yesterday, first estimates showed, defeating far-right leader Marine Le Pen in a pivotal vote for the future of the divided country and Europe. At 39, the former investment banker will be the country's youngestever leader and faces a huge challenge to heal a fractured and demoralized country. The vicious election campaign has exposed deep economic and social divisions, as well as tensions around identity and immigration.

Initial estimates showed Macron winning between 65 percent and 66.1 percent of the ballots - a higher than expected score - and Le Pen scoring between 33.9 percent and 35 percent. Unknown three years ago, Macron is now poised to become one of Europe's most powerful leaders, bringing with him a hugely ambitious agenda of political and economic reform for France and the European Union. The result will resonate worldwide and particularly in Brussels and Berlin where leaders will breathe a sigh of relief that Le Pen's anti-EU, anti-globalization program has been defeated.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel's

spokesman said it was a "victory for a strong and united Europe", while EU Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker said French voters had chosen a "European future". After Britain's vote last year to leave the EU and Donald Trump's victory in the US, the French election had been widely watched as a test of how high a tide of right-wing nationalism would rise.

MP HAYEF SAYS GOVERNMENT DELAYING CITIZENSHIP RETURN

MAID COMPANY TO START OPERATIONS IN SEPT

20,000 EXPATRIATES **DEPORTED IN 2016**

KUWAIT: According to the interior ministry's residency affairs directorate statistics, 19,730 expats of various nationalities were deported in 2016, ie 54 a day, who have no right to return to Kuwait unless they are granted an exemption by the interior minister. The statistics showed that over 1,000 expats had been deported on direct orders of the interior ministry's assistant undersecretary for passports and citizenship affairs Maj Gen Mazen Al-Jarrah, 2,741 were deported by airport authorities and 15,896 by the deportation department.

Statistics also showed that 11,191 expats were blacklisted for sponsoring others and issuing various types of visas, be they for domestic helpers or dependents. In addition, statistics showed that 880 companies had been inspected and 526 were closed down, including three owned by first-degree relatives of former ministers and lawmakers.

Moreover, statistics showed that 46,609 absconding reports were filed, mainly concerning male employees, including around 20,551 drivers.

KUWAIT: Islamist opposition MP Mohammad Hayef yesterday charged that the government was deliberately delaying the implementation of an agreement to reinstate the citizenships revoked from opposition figures. Hayef also criticized National Assembly Speaker Marzoug Al-Ghanem over his "negative" role in the issue, saying that the speaker's practices in this issue are unacceptable.

The government has formed a high-level committee to study the cases of Kuwaitis who had their citizenship revoked by the government for a variety of reasons. They include at least four leading opposition figures and their family members, who had their citizenships revoked almost three years ago. Following November's election in which the opposition made a good showing, the government pledged to reinstate the revoked citizenships. But Hayef said the process has taken a long time for no reason and reiterated that those citizenships were illegally revoked and should be immediately returned.

Meanwhile, the Assembly's health and labor committee discussed yesterday the implementation of a law to set up a company for the recruitment of domestic helpers, head of the committee said. MP Saad Al-Khanfour said the company is scheduled to start operations at the start of September and its offices have already been readied. The lawmaker said that the cost of the recruitment will drop by half when the company starts, adding that it will have offices for police screening and medical tests. The domestic helper will be handed over to the employer only after undergoing the necessary medical tests and police screening. He said the company will provide distinguished services not available at existing recruitment offices.

MP Shuaib Al-Muwaizri said yesterday that the decision on the non-cooperation motion against the prime minister will be taken only after the debate of the grilling scheduled for Wednesday. Muwaizri and MP Riyadh Al-Adasani filed to grill the prime minister over a variety of allegations.





KUWAITI COURTS

uwait's court system was established significantly earlier than the other Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries and the Kuwaiti rule of law was innovative for its time. As lawyers, we are very proud of our constitution and our legal system as a whole, but sometimes we do not realize that the system is not clear to the general public. Therefore, I have decided in today's article to explain the Kuwaiti court system in general and answer any questions that you may have.

Although I do not want to get into technicalities, there are a few points that I would like to make before answering your questions: 1) Kuwait is under civil law, meaning that the courts take into account the written law first before looking into previous judgments, unlike other jurisdictions like the United States, where common law is followed. 2) We have a threefold litigation system - cases start at the court of first instance, then the higher court of appeal, and finally the court of cassation/supreme court. This means there are three levels of the court system, giving people the chance to appeal a verdict should they feel that they need a second chance or have further evidence. 3) The court of cassation reviews the judgments of the other courts and decides whether they have applied the law.

Legal system

Question: A case has been filed against me at a police station/public prosecution. I would like to know how the legal system works in Kuwait. How many levels or stages are there to the case? When should I expect the case to end?

Fajer: The case first starts at the public prosecution. This will require you to go to a police station and be investigated by an investigator at least once. Investigations can take a few hours and sometimes even days, depending on the case. Then the investigators decide whether the matter needs to be reviewed in court or not. They can decide to dismiss the case or transfer the case to court.

The case will then go to the court's first level. Depending on the case, this can take from a few months to years - then if the verdict is appealed, the case will go to the court of appeal. Again, this will take from a few months to years. The case could also go to the court of cassation as I mentioned in point 3 above, but this is highly unlikely.

KD 5,001

Question: I always hear about a case being filed for KD 5,001 - I am wondering where the extra KD 1 comes from. Can you explain this to us?

Fajer: This is because the amount that you file for determines whether the case can be appealed and which court can handle the case. As I said above, I don't want to get into technicalities, but simply, a case filed for a claim that is less than KD 1,000 is final and cannot be appealed (which is why you also see KD 1,001). For claims that range between KD 1,001 and KD 5,000, the judgment can be appealed at a partial appeal court and not the high court of appeal. For cases involving KD 5,001 and above, the judgment is seen by the high court of appeal.

PARLIAMENT TO LOOK INTO THREE **GRILLING MOTIONS THIS WEEK**

Committee declines to lift MPs' immunity

KUWAIT: The National Assembly will go over three grilling motions during its ordinary session tomorrow and Wednesday, two addressing His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, and one targeting the Minister of State for Housing Affairs and Minister of State for Services Yasser Abul. MPs Dr Walid Al-Tabtabaei and Mohammad Al-Mutair lodged a five-point motion against His Highness the Premier.

According to the submitted motion, the first point is about the "violation of law and abuse of power by the government in a selective, retaliatory or politically motivated manner in its interpretation and application of the laws through issuing decrees and revoking the Kuwaiti citizenship from some of its holders." The second point deals with the "violation of international treaties and conventions and the abuse of power by the government in a selective, retaliatory or politically motivated manner by issuing legislation that is contrary to its obligations under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights." The third revolves around "rampant corruption" and "the insistence on appointing incompetent and unqualified figures in key and strategic positions in the country while removing competent people with proven aptitudes. The fourth addresses the government's action program "that was not prepared on solid foundations" and not keeping the strategic assets of the state," while the fifth faults the government for increasing burdens on citizens, and violating the principle of equality.

Irregularities

A second, one-axis motion targeting His Highness the Prime Minister, was filed by MPs Riyad Al-Adasani and Shuaib Al-Muwaizri on "financial, technical, construction and administrative irregularities," and the lack of tackling such violations due to negligence, poor follow-up.

The National Assembly on April 25 said that the two motions addressed to His Highness Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak would

be examined during a parliamentary session on May 10, as requested by the government.

His Highness the Prime Minister and the government requested delaying the debate till May 10, instead of May 9, due to protocol engagements. On Wednesday, His Highness the Prime Minister wrote to National Assembly Speaker Marzoug Al-Ghanem, seeking clarifications about some aspects of the grilling lodged against him by MPs Adasani and Shuaib Al-Muwaizri. His Highness the Prime Minister asked for detailed report of the alleged remarks, irregularities and violations contained in the grilling.

Meanwhile, MP Muwaizri lodged a fourpoint grilling motion against Minister Abul. He is seeking to question him about purported failure to bring into account the companies that made grave errors in construction of government houses in northwestern Al-Sulaibikhat, Jaber Al-Ahmad and Sabah Al-Ahmad, breaking the laws with respect of the housing projects in Al-Metlaa and Khairan and misleading the lawmakers during today's debate. This week's parliamentary session is expected to start with MP Farraj Al-Arbeed swearing in. Last week, the Constitutional Court stripped Marzouq Al-Khalifa of his parliament membership and granted the seat to Arbeed.

MPs' immunity

In other news, the parliament's committee on legislative and legal affairs has turned down a request from the Public Prosecution to lift the immunity of several MPs. Speaking to reporters following a committee meeting yesterday, the committee's head Mohammad Al-Dallal said the committee had overwhelmingly voted against the request to scrap the immunity of MPs Mubarak Al-Hajraf, Mubarak Al-Harees, Mohammad Al-Hediya and Tabtabaei. Meanwhile, the committee looked into draft laws pertinent to anticorruption efforts, financial disclosure declarations and public conduct, Dallal added.—KUNA

Bedoon pilgrims

Commenting on the Hajj convoy prices, Minister of Awgaf and Islamic Affairs and Minister of State for Municipality Affairs Mohammad Al-Jebri stressed that the market was open for everybody and that prices were subject to demand and offer without any interference from the ministry. "We are only concerned with administrative and organizational sides such as licenses, registry, leaves, quality control certificates, inspecting buildings and convoys," he underlined, pointing out that the ministry coordinates with relevant authorities in order to arrange for issuing bedoon pilgrims' visas to avoid the delay like last year.

Jebri stressed that the Awqaf ministry is the primary 'defense line' facing extremism and terrorism and that the most important measures taken to stop the spread of such terrorism will be monitoring social media networks in quest for any radical ideas pending conducting a full survey of religious extremism cases to set proper remedies. Jerbi said that special teams were formed to do the job and prepare sound religious responses to them.

Students' allowances

Kuwait Investment Authority (KIA) urged the finance ministry to remember a request it made five months earlier to open an account to pay the allowances of students dispatched on scholarships through Kuwait's cultural offices abroad. KIA had officially contacted the finance ministry in February asking for the approval of opening bank accounts in Washington, London and Paris.

Tenders

The Central Agency for Public Tenders notified government bodies of remarks about using up their financial allocations (budgets) a few weeks before the fiscal year was over. The apparatus also notified the concerned bodies of the need to restrict tenders and contracts in the last month of the fiscal year except in necessary cases approved by the minister in charge using written justifications.

informed to switch of air conditioning units in empty classes and rooms in a bid to save on energy in educational facilities. The Ministry of Education's (MOE) Assistant Undersecretary for Public Education Fatima Al-Kandari issued a directive to all public schools, urging all school staffs to make sure that all air conditioning units are switched off in empty classes and rooms, to close all doors and windows when the units are on, to set regulators to 27 C degrees, to replace any broken windows and to switch off all unnecessary lights, especially after school hours.

In other news, Kandari sent an official letter to MOE's administrative sector demanding exempting newly recruited English and French teachers from the 'prior experience' condition for hiring, especially since the foreign recruitment committee sent to Jordan failed to hire the number of teachers needed to cover up the shortage in male English teachers as well as male and female French teachers.



Question: Is it true that the process for employment-related cases is different? Some people say it is easier and less expensive, and that you will not need a lawyer. Is this true?

Fajer: The process is different for employment cases and this is because employment cases start at the Shuoon (Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor) before going to the courts. At the Shuoon, you will not need a lawyer and can do the process yourself, but you will need a lawyer to sign your documents in court. I highly suggest that if you are going to hire a lawyer for the court, then ask the same lawyer to be there at the Shuoon. This is because an investigation takes place at the Shuoon and the report is transferred to court with your case, which could make a difference. There are no court fees for employment cases. I hope the above information is useful.

MAN SENTENCED FOR BLACKMAILING FEMALE INVESTIGATOR

KUWAIT: The criminal court yesterday sentenced a Kuwaiti citizen to 10 years in jail with hard labor over charges of stealing a female investigator's mobile phone, posting her personal photos on social media and blackmailing her, said security sources.

Resignation

The Board of Directors of Kuwait Oil Company's (KOC) employees' syndicate submitted a letter of collective resignation from office due to some disagreements amongst board members ever since its formation, in addition to interference from people outside the board.

Consumer protection

The Ministry of Commerce and Industry's (MCI) Commercial Control Manager Nasser Al-Mutairi stressed that Minister Khaled Al-Roudhan is always in favor of activating the commercial control and consumer protection laws, adding that the ministry had prepared a special awareness campaign to enlighten consumers concerning their rights and duties related to returning purchases, refunding payments and reporting violations on various markets. Mutairi said that MCI had set a plan to protect consumers from commercial fraud and all kinds of monopoly.

Unsafe disposal

The Municipal Council's Deputy Chairman Meshaal Al-Jowaisri hailed the way the customs department handled 40 tons of inedible watermelons arriving from Iran, but criticized the fact that the shipment was disposed by being thrown in the Gulf, saying that this will negatively affect the marine environment. Jowaisri called for Kuwait Municipality's interference to destroy the shipment at one of its landfill sites. He also called for taking proper measures against those behind importing the shipment. Separately, member of the Municipal Council's technical committee Fahad Al-Sane asked the Ministry of Electricity and Water (MEW) about measures taken with regards to warnings about increasing levels of pollution resulting from the ministry's water desalination plants.

CBK TO IMPLEMENT SHARIA GOVERNANCE BY YEAR'S END

KUWAIT: The Central Bank of Kuwait (CBK) said yesterday that it was determined to develop the financial sector's workforce and that plans to introduce sharia governance will come into effect by the end of the year. Speaking on the sidelines of a workshop for Islamic financial institutions, CBK's Inspection Department Chairman Waleed Al-Awadhi revealed that sharia governance will be implemented after consultations with local banks and will be applied to all Kuwaiti banks.

On the workshop, he noted that it was organized in collaboration with the Accounting and Auditing Organization for Islamic Financial Institutions (AAOIFI). Moreover, Al-Awadhi said that the workshop, which features broad participation, aims to familiarize employees of the financial and banking sectors with sharia governance. Meanwhile, AAOIFI Secretary General Dr Hamid Mira said that Kuwait is among the pioneers of Islamic banking, noting that AAOIFI is a non-profit international organization formed in 1991 to prop up Islamic financial institutions. On sharia standards, he described them as concise guidelines that aim to ensure whether Islamic financial operations comply with sharia law. --KUNA

SILK ROAD PLAYS PIVOTAL ROLE IN CIVILIZATION

KUWAIT: The ancient Silk Road, an intercontinental network of trade routes that linked nations with different cultures, can once again contribute to the boom of human civilization. With an estimated total length of 15,000 kilometers, this network consists of several land and maritime routes across various regions in Eurasia and Africa from China in the Far East to central Asia, Persia and Arabian Peninsula, and further to Europa and North Africa in the west.

Trade convoys in the past used to take several months to reach their final destinations. The main traders were Chinese, Arab Turkmens, Indians, Persians, Somalis, Greeks, Syrians, Romans, Georgians and Armenians. Besides the trade exchanges, the silk road played a key role in bringing nations with different cultures close to each other and promoting their economic prosperity, and boosting studies in humanities.

Cultures and traditions

Tradesmen had to learn the languages, cultures and traditions of the people living along this network of roads, and know about the political developments and the dynasties of the cities, states and regions where they do business. In the course of time, cities located along the Silk Road prospered thanks to the guesthouses and restaurants built there to cater for tradesmen and travelers. Though the

historical network of trade routes was discov- back to the eighth century when the Islamic ered by the Chinese Han Dynasty (130 BC - 220 AD), the terms 'Silk Routes' or 'Silk Road' became common among historians only in late 19th century; they were coined by the German geographer Ferdinand von Richthofen who referred to them as ' Seidenstrasse' (Silk Road) or 'Seidenstrassen' (Silk Routes) in 1877.

Richthofen derived this term from the community monopolized by China for nearly 3,000 years. During this long time, the Chinese rulers used to execute anybody who ventures revealing the secret of the silk industry to an alien nation. The outstanding technical and cultural achievements of this network is the spread of the paper and printing industries and the flourish of scientific researches in such areas as geographical and archaeological explorations. This network carried not only goods but ideas, beliefs and traditions as well; it linked great civilizations Eurasia, the Middle East and Africa. According to historic references, the town of Chinag was considered the start of the Silk Road. Its natives were first among the peoples of China to embrace Islam by the Arab traders.

The Arabs played a pivotal role in the commerce on the Silk Road due to their countries' location between Asia and Europe. Islamic cultures and arts had gradually spread in China and many natives embraced Islam.

The Chinese ties with the Islamic nation date

empire spread eastwards and westwards, reaching the western borders of China. The Chinese in the beginning of their trading with the Arabs used to call the precious gems 'pebbles of the Arabs,' because they believed that the Arabs' lands were covered with these jewels.


Large effect

The Silk Road had largely affected ancient civilians, namely those of the Indians, the Egyptians and the Romans. When wars and bloody conflicts spread, many traders shifted to sea routes to pursue their trades. This led to great discoveries of new lands. The Silk Road had faded due to a number of reasons, such as mushrooming conflicts, great discoveries and the Turks' closure of the Suez Canal in 1869. The road reappeared between Asia and Europe in 2005, but this time with railways, stretching more than 10,000 kilometers.

In 2013, China launched the initiative, 'the belt and the road' with a new bid to strengthen its interactions with the world and boost global trade. China aspires that the grand project, forecast to cost billions of dollars, will link the nation with more than 60 states in Asia, Europe and Africa. On January 18, the first train loaded with Chinese products, part of this project, arrived in the British capital crossing 12,000 kilometers from China. — KUNA


AMIR SENDS CONDOLENCES

GANG ARRESTED AFTER STEALING KD 2.2 MILLION

KUWAIT: Detectives busted a large international gang that tampered with cheques of major companies, as criminal detectives in cooperation with Interpol arrested five suspects in two Arab countries, besides eight in Kuwait. The thirteen suspects forged over 60 cheques and stole KD 2.2 million. A security source said the gang was working cautiously and accurately using advanced techniques to avoid detection.

The gang was busted by chance, after a citizen came with a cheque worth KD 98,000, but it was discovered the person who signed it was authorized to sign for a maximum amount of KD 50,000. He said the original amount on the cheque was KD 180 only.

The case came to light when the manager of a company told Director General of Criminal Detectives Maj Gen Mohammad Al-Sharhan about a major forgery, when the bank they deal with told them a citizen wanted to cash a cheque worth KD 98,000, although the person who signed the cheque is authorized to sign for KD 50,000 only, which made the bank ask the citizen to return later because there was not enough cash.

A team from the financial crimes department was formed to investigate how the cheque's value was changed although approved signatures were on it. They found that all information was correct except for the amount. The cheque holder was placed under surveillance and later arrested. He told police that he frequents gambling halls in an Arab country, where he met a Jordanian who asked him to collect some money as he couldn't go, adding that the money is part of his indemnity as he was previously working in Kuwait.

The citizen agreed, and when he returned to Kuwait, a man called him and told him the Jordanian asked the cheque be given to the Kuwaiti to cash it. When he went to the bank, he was asked to wait and was told they will call him to get the money, but bank officials called security authorities.

It was discovered that the gang comprises of 13 persons - eight in Kuwait and five in two Arab countries. The detectives told the Kuwaiti to call the Jordanian, who in turn sent an expat to receive the money. He was arrested along with the person who gave him a ride, and both confessed they have been working with the Jordanian for a while, adding that they received over 60 cheques.

Policeman insulted

A traffic policeman issued a ticket to a Gulf national for a traffic violation, but the Gulf national objected and tore up the ticket. When the policeman objected, he said "it is my ticket and I tore it," then insulted him. The Gulf national and a friend who came to his aid were taken to the police station and charged with insulting an employee on duty.

No fight

A security source denied reports about a fight ending in murder. The source said it was a fight between youth over staring, and that police dealt with it and arrested four men. He said that one of those involved is epileptic and collapsed, so passersby thought he had died.

Court sentence suspended

The misdemeanors court ordered a person jailed for one week for insulting an employee at the civil information authority. But the court suspended the verdict for three years as he gave an undertaking and paid KD 300 for bail. The civil case was sent to the con-

A PERPLEXED PRESIDENT

he US new policy has become more money-oriented. With a purely commercial mind, US President Donald Trump is using a bunch of missiles and bombs to prove that he is this world's 'Superman' for the sake of squeezing the funds of rich countries such as Germany, China and, most importantly, Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states. US political norms have always given newly elected presidents a grace of the first one hundred days in office to be used as a 'honeymoon' period, during which the media takes it easy on him in order to avoid confusing his decisions and help him tidy things up and set the outlines of his policies towards various issues.

President Trump's honeymoon is over and initial reports about economic situations, which are considered messy by US media, are out. Trump has not brought any funds to the US treasury. There is no proof that he would be able to meet the promises he made during his electoral campaign unless he increases taxes on the middle class. Administrative situations within the White House were described by the media as 'hell' because of the chaos, too much hesitation and lack of political and administrative experience and skills with staff members.

In short, the new US administration only reflects an 'adolescent' mentality and haste to lead the world's number one body. Therefore, protests, demonstrations, and even confrontations amongst Americans are taking place, and will likely increase by time. Well, all of the above might be a domestic concern for the American people. The problem lies in foreign policies where 'foolishness and bullying' seem to control, as well.

Both president Trump and his secretary of state have been breaking promises about various issues, except the occasionally trying to demonstrate its powers randomly and pathetically. Within one week, Trump said he was not concerned about Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad's destiny. Hours later, he accuses him of using chemical warfare, then strikes the Shoairat airport with Tomahawks. He soon backed off after Russia showed him the 'redeye,' and yet he repeated his statements about not caring about Assad's fate and; declares instead that crushing the Islamic State (IS) was his priority.

Trump bombed Afghanistan with the world's largest bomb to kill only 30 Qaeda fighters; who could each kill over a hundred people by wearing a primitive bombed vest. He also threatened Iran with annulling the nuclear agreement, but then retreated and referred the matter to relevant authorities. He had praised Russian President Vladimir Putin and Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan during his campaign, but is now fighting them through Syria and Easte Europe.

GCC states are a different story. After strongly criticizing the rich GCC states, he declares a strategic alliance with Saudi Arabia before he shifted his attitude and considered providing it with US protection, which is costly. He also saw that Saudi Arabia was 'unfair' in its relation with Washington, and that it has to pump more funds into the US treasury. His defense secretary also threatened Qatar.

Contrarily, Trump threatened North Korea, saying he would teach it an unforgettable lesson if it kept firing ballistic missiles, but the Koreans were more convincing in making direct threats that made the 'Undertaker' Trump back off. Those are quick proofs that the US new policy has become more money-oriented.

FREED CHIBOK GIRLS TO MEET BUHARI

NIGERIA EXCHANGES GIRLS KIDNAPPED BY BOKO HARAM FOR PRISONERS

ABUJA: Eighty-two of the more than 200 schoolgirls kidnapped by Boko Haram in northeast Nigeria in 2014 arrived in Abuja yesterday to meet President Muhammadu Buhari after a prisoner swap deal secured their release. Presidency spokesman Femi Adesina said the schoolgirls from Chibok, in Borno state, were met at the capital's airport by Buhari's chief of staff Abba Kyari and taken to a medical facility for checks. "Welcome our girls, welcome our sisters, we are glad to have you back," Kyari told them, describing it as "a very joyous moment".

Military and civilian militia sources in the town of Banki, on the border with Cameroon, said the girls had left for Borno state capital Maiduguri on board six military helicopters at 6:10 am (0510 GMT). "One of the girls was carrying a baby with her, a boy of less than two years," said the source on condition of anonymity. The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), which said it "facilitated the safe return" of the girls as a "neutral intermediary", tweeted photographs of girls boarding a military helicopter.

A meeting with Buhari, who was swept to power in 2015 on a promise to defeat Boko Haram, had been scheduled for 4:00 pm local time (1500 GMT), officials in Abuja said. But there was no sign of the girls by 6:00 pm, an AFP reporter at the presidency said.

Prisoner swap

The presidency announced late on Saturday that months of talks with the jihadists had "yielded results" some six months after 21 other Chibok girls were freed with the help of international mediators. "Today 82 more Chibok girls were released," a statement said. "After lengthy negotiations, our security agencies have taken back these girls, in exchange for some Boko Haram suspects held by the authorities." No details were given about how many suspects were released or their identities. But AFP understands at least three suspected senior commanders, all of them Chadian nationals, were handed over. Information Minister Lai Mohammed said he could not confirm claims as many five militants were released.

Symbol of conflict

Boko Haram fighters stormed the Government Girls Secondary School in Chibok on the evening of April 14, 2014, and kidnapped 276 teenaged girls who were preparing to sit high school exams. Fifty-seven managed to escape in the hours that followed but the remaining 219 were held by the group. Boko Haram's Shekau claimed in a video message that they had converted to Islam. The audacious kidnapping brought the insurgency to world attention, triggering global outrage that galvanized support from the former US first lady Michelle Obama and Hollywood stars.

The girls have become a symbol of the Nigerian conflict. Last month, parents and supporters marked the three-year anniversary of the abduction, describing the situation as an unending "nightmare". But they said previous releases had given them strength. Enoch Mark, a Christian pastor whose two daughters were among those kidnapped, said of the latest releases: "This is good news to us. We have been waiting for this day. We hope the remaining girls will soon be released."

Military and civilian militia sources in Banki said the girls were brought back to the town in ICRC vehicles late on Saturday afternoon and stayed in the military barracks there overnight. Boko Haram has used kidnapping as a weapon of war, seizing thousands of women and children, and forcibly recruiting young men and boys into their ranks. In a less

publicized attack in November 2014, some 300 children were among about 500 people kidnapped from the town of Damasak, on the border with Niger, in the far north of Borno state. Most are still missing.

Ongoing talks

The release of the 21 girls in October last year followed talks between Boko Haram and the Nigerian authorities brokered by the ICRC and the Swiss government. Three other girls have also been found. The first had a baby and was accompanied by a man she said was her husband but the military said was a Boko Haram suspect. Shekau has previously said the girls would be released if militant fighters held in government custody were freed.

When the 21 were freed, Buhari's spokesman Garba Shehu said the government was hoping to secure the release of 83 others being held by a different Boko Haram faction. A total of 113 Chibok girls are now missing, although Shekau claimed last August that some had been killed in military air strikes. On Friday, Britain and the United States issued a security alert warning of a Boko Haram plot to kidnap foreigners in the Banki area, which led to the suspension of aid flights to the town on Saturday. — AFP

N KOREA DETAINS ANOTHER US CITIZEN IN FORTNIGHT

SEOUL: North Korea has detained another US citizen for committing "hostile acts", it said yesterday, its second arrest of an American in a fortnight with tensions high between Pyongyang and Washington. The arrest of Kim Hak-Song means that the North now is holding four US citizens, with the two countries at loggerheads over Pyongyang's nuclear and missile ambitions. Kim was detained on Saturday, the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) reported. "A relevant institution is now conducting detailed investigation into his crimes," it added.

The two-paragraph report gave no further details of the latest arrest. But it said Kim had been working for the Pyongyang University of Science and Technology (PUST) - an institution founded by evangelical Christians from overseas and opened in 2010, which is known to have a number of American faculty members. Pupils are generally children from the North's elite.

A State Department official in Washington yesterday issued a terse comment about the American's reported detention. "We are aware of reports that a US citizen was detained in North

Korea," the statement said. "The security of US citizens is one of the Department's highest priorities. When a US citizen is reported to be detained in North Korea, we work with the Swedish Embassy in Pyongyang, which serves as the United States' Protecting Power in North Korea," the State Department official said, adding that no additional comment was being offered "due to privacy considerations."

Kim is the second of the university's personnel to have been detained in as many weeks. Accounting professor Kim Sang-Duk, or Tony Kim, also a US citizen, was held on April 22, the North confirmed last week, for trying to "overturn" the regime. He was detained at the capital's airport as he tried to leave the country after teaching for several weeks at the university. KCNA said he had been held for "committing criminal acts of hostility aimed to overturn the DPRK," using an abbreviation for the country's official name. Using similar phrasing to vesterday's dispatch, it added that Kim was "under detention by a relevant law enforcement body which is conducting detailed investigation into his crimes." PUST officials could not immediately

be reached for comment in connection with Saturday's arrest. In a statement in late April the university said Tony Kim's arrest was "not connected in any way with the work of PUST."

Pyongyang is engaged in a tense standoff with the administration of US President Donald Trump over the North's banned missile and nuclear weapons programs. The North, which is widely seen as making progress toward building a missile capable of delivering a nuclear warhead to the US mainland, has carried out a series of launches this year. It has also warned that it could carry out a sixth nuclear test at any time.

But no blast took place during symbolic anniversaries in April, and its key ally and diplomatic protector China has urged restraint. Trump has suggested military action could be on the table but has softened his message more recently, saying he would be "honored" to meet the North's leader Kim Jong-Un under the right conditions. North Korea has arrested and jailed several US citizens in the past decade, often releasing them only after high-profile visits by current or former US officials or former US presidents. — AFP

TOP OBAMA OFFICIALS TO TESTIFY ON RUSSIAN INTERFERENCE

WASHINGTON: The scandal over Russian meddling in last year's US presidential election returns to the forefront of Washington politics after weeks of quiet today, when two top officials from the Obama administration are set to testify in Congress. Sally Yates - acting attorney general in the Trump administration for 10 days before being fired - could bring new pressure on the White House over what it knew about former national security adviser Michael Flynn's communications with Russian officials.

Obama's director of national intelligence James Clapper is also set to testify, after repeatedly warning of the need to get to the bottom of how the Russians interfered in the election, and whether anyone on President Donald Trump's team colluded with Moscow. The case simmered for weeks as attention focused on what keynote legislation the president could push through in his first 100 days, a milestone reached last week.

Congressional investigations into Russian meddling have also been held up by infighting between Democrats and Republicans over how aggressively to pursue a matter that continues to cast a cloud over Trump's election win. Dianne Feinstein, the top Democrat on the Senate Intelligence Committee, which also is investigating Russia's role in the election, said she is eager to hear Yates's testimony. "Sally Yates is very much respected. She's a professional. She's not a politician. She's spent a lot of time in the department," Feinstein told NBC News's "Meet the Press" program. "She apparently has some information as to who knew what when that she is willing to share and that would be what she knew about Michael Flynn's connections to Russia," said Feinstein.

Trump: Russia story is 'phony'

Trump last week repeated his dismissal of US intelligence chiefs' conclusion that Moscow had sought to boost his campaign over his Democratic rival Hillary Clinton's in an effort overseen by Russian President Vladimir Putin. In an interview with CBS's "Face the Nation" program marking his 100 days, Trump last week again rejected the official view that Russians hacked Democratic Party computers and communications. "(It) could have been China, could have been a lot of different groups," he said.

On Tuesday, he again branded the whole story as fake. "The phony Trump/Russia story was an excuse used by the Democrats as justification for losing the election," he said on Twitter. Trump's dismissals notwithstanding, the Senate Judiciary Committee where Yates and Clapper are to appear today - and the House and Senate intelligence committees are stepping up their probes, calling numerous current and former government witnesses to testify, mostly behind closed doors. And the FBI is continuing its own investigation into possible collusion.

The country's top intelligence officials say they have no doubt that Moscow tried to swing the election against Clinton last year through hacking and disinformation. Nor do they doubt that people closely associated with the Trump campaign including Flynn, onetime foreign affairs adviser Carter Page and former campaign chairman Paul Manafort - all had ongoing contacts with Russians. But whether those contacts resulted in any collusion with Moscow remains unproved.

Asked on CNN last week if she had yet seen evidence of collusion in private intelligence briefings, Feinstein responded: "Not at this time." In today's open hearing, Yates - an Obama deputy attorney general who was fired by Trump for refusing to support his immigration ban - reportedly could testify that she warned the incoming administration in January that Flynn's discussions with Russia's US ambassador left Flynn vulnerable to blackmail. A former military intelligence chief, Flynn was Trump's national security adviser for 24 days before he was fired for lying about the substance of the calls. Clapper, still bound by secrecy requirements of his former job, might not add more than what the intelligence community has already said publicly about the scandal.

Subpoena warnings

The more serious investigative action in the coming weeks will take place out of the public eye. The House and Senate intelligence committees are holding interviews with current intelligence and Trump campaign officials behind closed doors. The Senate side has warned possible witnesses, including Flynn, Page and Manafort, that they could be subpoenaed to testify if they do not voluntarily cooperate, according to the New York Times.

In a statement Friday, the top senators of the Senate committee specifically warned Page, a former Moscow-based investment banker, to meet their week-old request for specific documents. "Should Mr Page choose to not provide the material requested" by specified dates, they said, "the committee will consider its next steps." — AFP

ROW SHINES SPOTLIGHT ON ANTI-OCCUPATION GROUP

TEL AVIV: Former Israeli combat soldiers who were thrust into the center of a recent diplomatic row between Israel and Germany, say the sudden international spotlight has given them a bigger stage to speak out against Israel's 50-year rule over millions of Palestinians. Breaking the Silence is a group of ex-soldiers-turnedwhistleblowers who view Israel's open-ended occupation of lands sought for a Palestinian state as an existential threat to their country.

Since 2004, the group has collected testimony from more than 1,100 fellow soldiers who describe the dark side of that rule, including seemingly routine mistreatment of Palestinian civilians stripped of basic rights. The veterans hope such accounts by former fighters will carry weight and spark public debate about the moral price of the occupation.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and top officials in his nationalist government have a starkly different view. They have branded Breaking the Silence as foreignfunded subversives who are trying to defame Israel and its military. Most recently, Netanyahu even seemed willing to rattle Israel's relationship with key European ally Germany to score points against Breaking the Silence, which has 16 paid staffers, several dozen volunteers and an annual budget of about \$2 million.

Two weeks ago, he said he would not receive German Foreign Minister Sigmar Gabriel if the visitor stuck to plans to meet with Breaking the Silence. Gabriel chose the soldiers instead. Netanyahu, who also serves as foreign minister, said that shunning visitors who meet with Breaking the Silence is now official policy.

The fallout continues this week. The dis-

Israelis have been bitterly divided over what to do with the West Bank, Gaza Strip and east Jerusalem, lands they captured in June 1967. Israel annexed east Jerusalem immediately after the war and retains overall control over the West Bank, with enclaves of Palestinian self-rule. Israel unilaterally withdrew from Gaza in 2005 and has enforced a border blockade of the territory since it was seized by the Islamic militant Hamas two years later.

Many Israelis support the idea of Palestinian statehood in principle, but believe it's not safe to cede war-won territories now. Fears were stoked by three Israel-Hamas wars since 2008 and an escalation of regional conflicts. Meanwhile, partition is increasingly difficult, with 600,000 Israelis already living on occupied lands and settlements expanding steadily.

Netanyahu has said he is willing to resume partition talks with the Palestinians, but gaps remain wide. A majority of his Cabinet ministers oppose a two-state solution and some even call for annexing parts of the West Bank, raising fears among some Israelis that their rule over disenfranchised Palestinians will become permanent. Shaul said he and his comrades are the true patriots, not those clinging to occupied territories.

"I believe Jews have a right to self-determination in the Holy Land. But I refuse to accept that the only way I will be allowed to implement my right to self-determination is if I strip my neighbors, the Palestinians, of the exact same right I demand for myself," he said. "A permanent occupation is the most anti-Zionist position one can ever have because it says we are doomed to live in a sin." The beginnings of Breaking the Silence go back to Hebron, the West Bank's largest Palestinian city, where hundreds of troops guard roughly the same number of Jewish settlers in an Israeli-controlled center partly off limits to Palestinians. — AP

TEHRAN: Angry coal miners besieged a car carrying Iranian President Hassan Rouhani yesterday after he visited the site of a deadly mine explosion, a rare protest targeting the nation's top elected official as he campaigns for re-election. Soot-covered miners, enraged over the disaster that reportedly killed at least 35 miners Wednesday in Iran's northern Golestan province, kicked and beat the armored SUV carrying Rouhani.

The incident offered an extraordinary sign of very public dissent ahead of Iran's May 19 presidential poll, a contest largely viewed as a referendum on Rouhani and his nuclear deal with world powers. Official state media did not immediately report on the incident, first brought to light by videos posted online by the semi-official Fars and Tasnim news agencies. Both are believed to have links to Iran's hard-line Revolutionary Guard, a paramilitary force that Rouhani criticized during a televised presidential debate on Friday.

Fars went so far as to say on Twitter that state media "had censored pictures" of the protests, without elaborating. Videos showed one miner atop the SUV carrying Rouhani, a banner in his hand, as another miner jumped up and down and kicked its hood. Others beat the hood and body of the SUV. "Dear brothers! I beg you wait for a couple of minutes!" someone shouts.

Rouhani's SUV eventually nudges its way through the crowd amid the shouting. Another miner rushes up to kick the back of it as it sped away down a hill. Another Tasnim video shows a woman in a black chador rush into the path of the SUV, shouting: "Please God, help me!" Presidential bodyguards hang off the sides of the SUV, but largely don't interact with the crowds as police in dress uniforms are unable to keep the crowd from swarming it and throwing stones. The SUV appeared largely undamaged from the incident.

Hamid Aboutalebi, a political adviser to Rouhani, later tweeted that the provincial governor of Golestan had told him not to let the president travel to the mine as those there were still greatly upset over the disaster. "President Rouhani told me I am the president in the time of their pain and fervor, if their shouts at me could lead to national peace, I have to go," Aboutalebi wrote.

Rouhani had traveled to the Zemestanyourt mine to give a speech to miners and their families gathered there. He acknowledged that as the government, "we are responsible for their lives and is it our duty". "Be sure that we will pursue this issue and also your demands," Rouhani said. "Those who are guilty in this incident should be prosecuted by a court."

The explosion Wednesday happened after the coal mine filled with methane gas, sickening dozens who later rushed into the mine to try to rescue those trapped. Three semi-official news agencies have said at least 35 people were killed in the disaster. Iranian officials say they've recovered 22 bodies and their search continues. Rouhani himself had said before being besieged that it was his vice president who was set to visit the site, but "I decided to visit you myself."

His stop by came amid his campaigning for another four-year term as Iran's elected president, serving under the country's Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, who has final say over all state matters. Rouhani remains the favorite in the election as every Iranian president since Khamenei himself took the presidency in 1981 has won re-election. However, many in the country remain discontent as the benefits of the nuclear deal have yet to trickle down to the average Iranian.

Hardliners opposed to Rouhani and the deal have detained and convicted dual nationals on secret spying charges and ordered tense encounters with US Navy vessels in the Arabian Gulf. Rouhani, who typically shies away from direct criticism of the Guard, openly accused them during Friday's debate of trying to scuttle the accord. He pointed to a March 2016 ballistic missile launch by the Guard that saw the weapon marked with Hebrew writing reading "Israel must be wiped out" as one instance of them trying to sabotage it. The mine explosion also marks the second major disaster to strike Iran in recent months. In January, a high-rise tower in Tehran that caught fire collapsed and killed 26 people, including 16 firefighters, leading to mourning nationwide. — AP

FRENCHMAN KIDNAPPED IN CHAD FREED IN SUDAN

KHARTOUM: A French mineworker who was kidnapped in Chad and taken to neighboring Sudan has been freed after more than six weeks in captivity, French and Sudanese officials said yesterday. Thierry Frezier, 60, was freed after collaboration between Sudanese, Chadian and French intelligence services, a member of the National Intelligence and Security Service (NISS) told reporters in Khartoum. Frezier was taken to Sudan's capital after being freed on Saturday.

French President Francois Hollande's office put out a statement saying he felt "great pleasure" at the release. Sudanese security agents launched a search for Frezier in late March after a Chadian minister said he was being held there after being abducted near Goz Beida in southeastern Chad on March 23. His kidnappers took him to Sudan's wartorn region of Darfur and it was from there that he was liberated, a foreign ministry official in Khartoum said. "I thank Sudan's government and civil and military authorities for their efforts to free me," Frezier said in a brief statement to reporters at Khartoum airport yesterday. "The kidnappers treated me well during my time in captivity." NISS officer Mohamed Hamid said Frezier would

be handed over to the French embassy in Khartoum. "An operation to free him was launched in coordination with French and Chadian intelligence services," Hamid said.

Sudanese and French officials in Khartoum said no ransom had been paid. "The outlaws inside

Chad had kidnapped him for ransom, but no ransom has been paid," Sudanese foreign ministry official Khalid Al-Kalas said yesterday. "NISS was monitoring his situation and yesterday they liberated him and also captured his kidnappers."

France's charge d'affaires in Khartoum, Christian Bec, also told reporters that no money had been handed over in exchange for Frezier's freedom. "I thank the Sudanese government for liberating the hostage without paying any ransom," Bec said. Several French and other Western nationals have been kidnapped by militant groups in west and central Africa in recent years. The last such case in Chad - a former French colony - was in 2009, when a Frenchman working for the International Committee of the Red Cross was abducted by a shadowy armed group called the Freedom Eagles of Africa, based in Sudan's Darfur province. He was freed after 89 days. — AFP

EX-NUSRA FIGHTERS TO BE EVACUATED FROM CAMP

BEIRUT: Agreement has been reached to evacuate wounded fighters of the hardline Islamist group formerly known as Nusra Front from Yarmouk, in the southern suburbs of Damascus, to rebel-held Idlib province, Hezbollah-affiliated Al-Manar TV reported yesterday. The agreement is the second phase of an earlier deal to evacuate people from two towns besieged by rebels, and two towns besieged by pro-government forces, the first phase of which was implemented last month, Al-Manar reported.

The wounded fighters and some others accompanying them would form a group of about 50, reported the television channel, which is based in Lebanon. Hezbollah, also from Lebanon, is a close military ally of Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad. Nusra Front was the official branch of Al-Qaeda in Syria until a year ago, when it broke formal allegiance to the global jihadist movement and renamed itself.

It has since joined a number of other

militant groups under the new name Tahrir Al-Sham. Both Nusra Front and later Tahrir Al-Sham have at times fought alongside other rebel groups, including those that operate under the banner of the Free Syrian Army, against the government and at times have clashed with them. Yarmouk, in the southern suburbs of Damascus, is the location of a large Palestinian refugee camp. Parts of the area are held by the government, parts by rebels including Tahrir Al-Sham, and parts by Islamic State.

An earlier deal involved evacuating civilians from the rebel-besieged Shiite towns of Kefraya and Al-Foua in Idlib province in return for the departure of civilians and insurgent fighters from Zabadani and Madaya, near Damascus. Completed late last month, that agreement was the largest and most complex so far in a series of evacuation deals for besieged areas that have grown more common over the past year in Syria's civil war. — Reuters

WOMEN TAKE ON THE FIGHT AGAINST MADURO

CARACAS: Thousands of women dressed in white marched in Venezuela's capital Saturday to keep pressure on President Nicolas Maduro, whose authority is being increasingly challenged by protests and deadly unrest. Led by opposition leaders, lawmakers and Lilian Tintori - the wife of jailed opposition leader Leopoldo Lopez the crowd carried flowers and placards denouncing "repression".

Police and soldiers initially prevented it from reaching the interior ministry. But the women - led by several lawmakers - eventually made it to the interior and justice ministries. "We are not going to be off the streets until we have set Venezuela free," conservative opposition leader Maria Corina Machado said. "We beg the armed forces: don't open fire on unarmed people." Some women flashed their breasts in a pacifist move as some alongside Machado waved posters reading: "We have no firearms; just t**s."

Similar anti-Maduro rallies took place in other cities, including San Cristobal and Aragua, where police fired tear gas canisters against marchers. Protests Saturday night in Los Nuevos Teques, on the outskirts of the capital, and Barquisimeto in the country's west descended into clashes between demonstrators and the military. It was not immediately known if there were casualties. More protests are set for Sunday with musicians and other celebrities marching to remember the dead.

The demonstrations were the latest in more than a month of anti-government protests, many of which have been countered by pro-Maduro crowds and security forces. The death toll since April - when the protests intensified after Maduro's administration and the courts stepped up efforts to undermine the opposition - is at least 36, according to prosecutors, with hundreds more injured. looked like disaster zones with bars on shop windows bent and windows broken. Demonstrators blame Maduro for the country's plight and the shortages of food and medicine. They are demanding elections to remove the leftist president.

Maduro, backed by the Venezuelan military, is resisting. He and the opposition have blamed each other of using armed groups to sow violence. The president has started a process to rewrite the current constitution enacted under his late predecessor and mentor Hugo Chavez. The opposition and many protesters say his real aim is to dodge elections. Maduro supporters also marched in Caracas, railing against what they called "violence by terrorists," Minister for Women Blanca Eekhout said. "We are out here pushing for justice against those who are encouraging hatred and rage," she said, warning, "they are trying to set the stage for civil war."

The conference of Catholic bishops issued a statement quoting Pope Francis as expressing concern about the "dead, wounded and detained" in the protests and asking both sides to look for "negotiated solutions."

US tone sharpens

Maduro and his officials say the crisis rocking the country is a US-backed conspiracy designed to topple him and install a right-wing government. The United States, which had remained relatively quiet over the situation in Venezuela, is now taking a stronger tone against Maduro's "violent crackdown on protestors". The US ambassador to the UN, Nikki Haley, said in a statement that his "disregard for the fundamental rights of his own people has heightened the political and economic crisis in the country."

She called for the immediate release of "political prisoners," including Lopez, who

SEX ASSAULTS IN US HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS MINIMIZED AS 'HAZING'

VIOLENCE IS NORMALIZED AND PERSISTS FOR YEARS

WASHINGTON: The Georgia school district said it was investigating the baseball players for "misbehavior" and "inappropriate physical contact." What it didn't reveal was that a younger teammate had reported being sexually assaulted. Even after players were later disciplined for sexual battery, the district cited student confidentiality to withhold details from the public and used "hazing" to describe the incident, which it also failed to report to the state as required.

Across the US, perhaps nowhere is student-on-student sexual assault as dismissed or as camouflaged as in boys' sports, an Associated Press investigation found. Mischaracterized as hazing and bullying, the violence is so normalized on some teams that it persists for years, as players attacked one season become aggressors the next. Coaches frequently say they're not aware of what's happening. But AP found multiple cases where coaches knew and failed to intervene or, worse, tried to cover it up.

The AP examined sexual violence in school sports as part of its larger look at student-on-student sex assaults . Analyzing state education records, supplemented by federal crime data, AP found about 17,000 official reports of sex assaults by students in grades K-12 over a recent four-year period. That figure doesn't capture the extent of problem because attacks are widely under-reported and not all states track them or classify them uniformly.

Nor does the data paint a detailed picture of specific incidents, revealed when the AP reviewed more than 300 cases of student-on-student sexual violence that surfaced through law enforcement records, lawsuits, interviews and news accounts. In those cases, the sports setting emerged as a leading venue for such attacks. Teammate-on-teammate sexual assaults occurred in all types of sports in public schools, and experts said the more than 70 cases in five years that AP identified were the tip of the iceberg. Though largely a high school phenomenon, some cases were reported as early as middle school.

Boys made up the majority of aggressors and victims in teammate attacks, records show, and some suffered serious injury and trauma. An Idaho football player was hospitalized in 2015 with rectal injuries after he was sodomized with a coat hanger. That same year, a North Carolina teen suffered rectal bruising when he was jabbed through his clothes with a broomstick. Parents of a Vermont athlete blamed his 2012 suicide on distress a year after teammates sodomized him with a broom. "It's basically rape and sexual assault," said Hank Nuwer, a hazing historian at Franklin College in Indiana. "It's amazing to me that there hasn't been a public outcry on this to help stop it."

The acts meet federal law enforcement definitions of rape and sexual assault, but language shrouds the problem and minimizes its severity. It also shapes how coaches and schools respond, and can influence whether off-campus authorities hold anyone accountable. "Language is everything," said B. Elliot Hopkins, a sports safety expert at the National Federation of State High School Associations. "If anyone knew that their kid was going to run the risk of being sexually assaulted to be part of a team, we wouldn't have anyone playing any sports."

Playing with Words

What really happened on the Georgia baseball team - compared to the school district's official statement - is outlined in graphic detail in state education, police and court records AP obtained. The players from Parkview High School, in the Atlanta suburb of Lilburn, were playing in a tournament in South Carolina in June 2015. That year's squad would be defending the school's third state championship and second Baseball America High School Team of the Year title since 2011. Over a pizza dinner, an upperclassman warned several freshmen to "sleep with one eye open tonight" and specifically threatened sexual violence. At the team hotel later, with coaches nowhere in sight, five to eight upperclassmen barged into a room and ordered three freshmen out of hiding. Over shouts of "get his a**", they pinned down one boy, and through his shorts, he felt fingers shoved into his rectum. They pulled down another boy's shorts. He got them back up, but the attackers grabbed and punched his testicles. The third managed to flee. To gain entry to a second room, one of the upperclassmen pretended to be a freshman and obtained a key from the front desk. Inside, the aggressors blocked the door and ganged up on one boy. Only when he broke free and threatened to tell the coach did the assault stop. "We don't want to be raped!" another terrified boy pleaded. The upperclassmen didn't challenge the evidence in disciplinary proceedings, but described what they did to the freshmen as "wrestling and horse playing". Targeting rookies for humiliating, and even risky, rituals is not new to sports. However, experts say the last 10 to 15 years have seen an escalation into sexual violence. The reasons why aren't entirely clear, and research on sports hazing rarely addresses these assaults in depth. But players, perhaps influenced by sexualized pop culture, seem to be trying to one-up what was done to them, experts say. Although many of the cases AP identified included anal penetration, grabbing crotches or grinding genitals into teammates, those who often first learn of incidents coaches, school officials - routinely characterize them as hazing, bullying or initiations. People don't want to think kids could act that way and chalk it up to jock behavior, said Danielle Rogers, who in 2011 prosecuted lockerroom assaults by three athletes in Hardin, Montana. "If this had happened on the street, nobody would say this is hazing or bullying," she said. Because of that mislabeling, such cases don't always show up in state education records or federal crime data as sexual assault, and no one specifically tracks or catalogs them in a systemic way. School districts frequently won't divulge information about attacks, fighting public records requests or declining to answer basic questions. Sometimes that's because they're trying to be sensitive to students. Other times, experts say, it's about protecting school image. "Does a school district really want it out that they're not protecting kids and kids are being sexually assaulted, and then turn around and ask you for money to build a new library?" Hopkins said. In the Georgia case, a draft public statement from the Gwinnett County Public Schools initially said a player's family had reported he was "sexually assaulted," according to records AP obtained. But the final version referred only to "inappropriate physical contact." When asked, district officials said that wording was "more inclusive" of the "diversity of the types of misconduct alleged." Months later, after several upperclassmen were disciplined in part for sexual battery or aggravated sexual battery, the district shared the public statement that described the ordeal as "hazing". Officials argued they didn't have to report the incident in data the state collects on school violence because it happened in the summer. The Georgia Department of Education told AP the district was wrong and would need to correct its filing. Georgia school administrators were not alone in their toned-down language. In South Carolina, where the baseball tournament was held, police logged the incident as a "possible hazing" and "simple assault," despite its own report saying a freshman's father alleged players "sexually violated two other boys." There were no charges, and North Charleston police declined comment.


Where are Coaches?

Coaches serve as parental figures in many schools and communities, especially where sports are a source of civic pride. They are entrusted with the care of players at night, on weekends and during out-of-town trips. They call teams "family". While many live up to that image, coaches in several cases AP examined fostered the opportunity for misconduct through poor supervision. Some coaches became aware of misbehavior but treated it as a team disciplinary matter. Others failed to do anything.

after seeing him bleeding. A nurse, not the coaches, contacted authorities. Back at the cabin, the head coach's wife cleaned up and threw the boy's soiled clothing into a garbage can, "essentially erasing evidence of the crime," investigators said.

The head coach called the boy's mother but "grossly minimized" his condition, so she allowed her son to remain with the team, authorities said. After his discharge from the hospital, the boy returned to the cabin, collapsed and had to be rushed into emergency surgery to repair a damaged bladder, colon and rectal wall.

The head coach instructed players at some point to keep quiet, investigators found. No school official including an athletic director, principal, assistant superintendent and superintendent - immediately called other parents. Another victim's mother found out the next day only because she called a coach to find out how the Ooltewah High School team's game went. "If this boy had not gone to the hospital, had he not been bleeding, nobody would have known about this," said Eddie Schmidt, a lawyer representing the player's family, which did not respond to interview requests.

The head coach and other school officials said in legal responses they didn't know about the violence or seek to withhold information from parents. The coach and his wife, who was not charged, did not respond to messages. While the accused attackers were ultimately prosecuted, the adults ultimately escaped prosecution. A judge ruled that the failure-to-report laws didn't apply in player-onplayer abuse, a gap that some state legislators want to close. And while coaches in the Tennessee, Florida, Texas and New Mexico cases lost their jobs, some returned to work elsewhere. For instance, the Texas basketball coach from the Dallas suburb of Flower Mound - is now at a private school. Charles Freet told AP that remarks he and his assistant made at the time "accurately explain what occurred and I have nothing more to add."

Laws Impact Accountability

In many ways, what happened among high school basketball players in Leechburg, Pennsylvania, a small town outside Pittsburgh, is a microcosm of the problem. Some Leechburg players were sodomizing teammates with a phallic-shaped piece of wood they called a "yoshi" stick, records and interviews show. If someone goofed in practice, players would yell, "You're getting yoshied!" After two boys' parents complained in Jan 2016, the school investigated for half a day and the principal sent a one-page letter saying the boys simply were "harassed by three varsity players with a wooden stick". The players were briefly suspended, but the district reported zero incidents in the 10 sex offense categories the state education department requires it to track.

Someone alerted authorities, and Leechburg police soon said they had unraveled additional assaults dating back 10 years. In March 2016, Chief Michael Diebold announced "there may have been catastrophic failure within the school district." But no charges were filed because Diebold said either victims declined to press for them or incidents hadn't escalated enough to meet the legal standards for sexual assault or other charges. Diebold said Pennsylvania's hazing law also wasn't available because it applied only to colleges at the time. He decided to leave the case open should a witness or other victim come forward.

Lack of serious consequences can raise doubts about allegations that already have been mislabeled by schools or coaches, said Susan Lipkins, a New York psychologist and author who specializes in sports attacks. And that can lead to backlash against victims, she noted, with communities uniting behind coaches or accused players. The parents of one of the targeted Leechburg boys said his family is now afraid to dine out in public because of blowback. "We've pretty much been ostracized from the community," the boy's father told AP Meanwhile, Leechburg Coach Damian Davies eventually lost his position, but many fans, parents and former players rallied in his support. He remains a teacher and unpaid coach for girls' basketball and has sued the district for a copy of its internal investigative report, which he believes will clear him. "No players have ever come to me" Davies said. "As the players told me, either nothing happened or if it did it was a joke."

TEXAS ADOPTION AGENCIES COULD BAN JEWS, MUSLIMS

AUSTIN: Parents seeking to adopt children in Texas could soon be rejected by statefunded or private agencies with religious objections to them being Jewish, Muslim, gay, single, or interfaith couples, under a proposal in the Republican-controlled Legislature. Five other states have passed similar laws protecting faith-based adoption organizations that refuse to place children with gay parents or other households on religious grounds - but Texas' rule would extend to state-funded agencies. Only South Dakota's is similarly sweepingly.

The bill had been scheduled for debate and approval Saturday in the state House, but lawmakers bogged down with other matters. It now is expected to come up next week. Republican sponsors of Texas' bill say it is designed to support the religious freedom of adoption agencies and foster care providers. Many of the agencies are private and faith-based but receive state funds.

But opponents say it robs children of stable homes while funding discrimination with taxpayer dollars. "This would allow adoption agencies to turn away qualified, loving parents who are perhaps perfect in every way because the agency has a difference in religious belief," said Catherine Oakley, senior legislative counsel for the Human Rights Campaign. "This goes against the best interest of the child." The bill also blatantly violates the Constitution, Oakley added. "As a governmental entity, Texas is bound to treat people equally under the law," said Oakley. "This is a violation of equal protection under the law."

State Rep James Frank, the bill's author, said it's designed to address the state's foster care crisis by making "reasonable accommodations so everyone can participate in the system." "Everyone is welcome. But you don't have to think alike to participate," said Frank, a Republican from rural Wichita Falls, near Texas' border with Oklahoma. A federal judge in 2015 ruled that the state's foster care system violated youngsters' constitutional rights. Republican Gov Greg Abbott made fixing it an "emergency" priority and the Legislature has increased funding while backing a number of major changes.

No Alternatives

Suzanne Bryant, an Austin-based adoption attorney who works with LGBT clients and was one of the first individuals to have a legal same-sex marriage in Texas, said the bill fails to provide alternatives for prospective parents rebuffed by adoption agencies. "Say you call an agency and say, 'I'm Jewish,' and it's a Catholic agency and they hang up on you," said Bryant. "The bill says you can be referred to another agency, but there's no mechanism to set that up."

Not only could agencies turn away hopeful parents under the religious freedom provision, but they could require children in the foster care system to comply with their faith-based requirements, said Bryant. That means child welfare organizations could send LGBT kids to conversion therapy, a treatment designed to turn people straight - which the Pan American Health Organization calls a "serious threat to the health and well-being of affected people." And they could deny young people contraception and abortions.

"If a 17-year-old who is sexually active wants birth control, the burden to prove that constitutional right is on the child," said Bryant. "They don't have their parents advocating for them and supposed to go it alone against the system." Frank said most adoptions happen through the state's Child Protective Services, which would not be subject to the religious freedom mandate, though outside agencies that receive state funding would be. He said his bill "codifies" the choices adoption agencies are already making as they select parents.

"My guess is if you have an LGBT agency they're going to pick an LGBT family, and if you have a Baptist agency they may be more likely to pick a Baptist family," Frank said. "They're free to do that and should be free to do that." Frank also said the bill directs state child services to ensure that other outside adoption providers without religious objections are made available to help would-be adoptive parents who get turned away by any who do raise objections. But his proposal is just one of 24 pending bills in the Texas Legislature that LGBT advocates say encourage discrimination. —AP ARGYLE, Texas: High school basketball coach Charles Freet stands on the sidelines during a junior varsity basketball game on Feb 10, 2017. • In Texas, a teacher reported in 2011 that basketball players were putting their fingers in teammates' bottoms. The coach insisted the action was merely a joke and not hazing, and his assistant called the complaint a "misrepresentation" by a "disgruntled player and father," school records show. The district told AP the allegations were reported to authorities, but police said they were not notified.

• Two New Mexico football coaches walked in just after a player was sodomized with a broomstick in 2008. The boys laughed it off as an "initiation" and coaches took no action, failing to halt a subsequent attack, district records show. Seven victims later sued, settling for \$5 million.

Then there's a Dec 2015 case involving a Tennessee basketball team, investigated jointly by the prosecutor's and sheriff's offices in Chattanooga, along with an outside review the Hamilton County school district commissioned. The law enforcement report shows that a freshman confided to a coach that upperclassmen had sexually assaulted him and others with a pool cue in a cabin during an out-of-town tournament trip.

Despite that warning, the upperclassmen continued unchecked. Two went on to pin another boy face down on a bed as a third thrust a pool cue into his rectum, shredding two layers of clothing and breaking off the tip inside him. The coaches, who were elsewhere in the cabin, heard him scream and drove him to a hospital

Changing a Culture

Often in sports, a culture of acceptance sets in and enables further abuse. Experts say players are indoctrinated when they're new, transition into bystanders seeing others harmed and sometimes become attackers themselves, feeling a form of duty to uphold team "tradition." Some players may even think enduring such acts builds team toughness. But more often, Lipkins said, older players use sexual violence to exert dominance over newer or smaller boys vying for the roster. "What's worse for a young jock than to be emasculated to the lowest level, to be like a girl?" she said.

Athletes who are sexually assaulted feel particularly pressured to stay silent, experts say. After all, speaking up could jeopardize a spot in the lineup they've trained years for, or risk team success by getting other players in trouble. Amanda Jackson's son waited two years to tell her what he said he experienced as a freshman at Capital High School in Olympia, Washington.

After showering at a 2010 basketball camp, he was tackled by four upperclassmen who tried to penetrate him with their fingers, according to his deposition in the family's pending lawsuit against the Olympia School District. The boy said he didn't want to worry his mom, plus he was "afraid to tell on my teammates". "I felt like if I told someone," he testified, "then I would have been, you know, excluded from the team and not able to play varsity basketball." He finally spoke up after more boys were jumped at a similar camp, leading the district to investigate the school. A psychological evaluation conducted as part of the lawsuit showed Jackson's son exhibited post-traumatic stress symptoms. He went on to play college basketball, but his mother still worries about him."I want to get everything out there so people understand this is not normal," she said. "I am sick and tired as a parent of running into individuals, professional individuals, who do this 'Oh, boys will be boys.'"

Peg Pennepacker, who specializes in legal issues for the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association, said safety training would help alter those attitudes. "If we don't make a cultural shift at the K-12 level, nothing's going to change," said Pennepacker, athletic director at Pennsylvania's State College Area School District. Hopkins, the sports safety expert, said sexual violence could end "overnight" if schools stressed the dangers to players and coaches, encouraged speaking out and taught healthy team-bonding. "We have the power and skill sets in schools to end it," he said. "But adults aren't saying the proper words to the kids and adults aren't saying the proper words to the coaches. And that's why it goes on." —AP

FRENCH ELECTION: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

PARIS: Pro-EU centrist Emmanuel or she can serve a maximum of two Macron takes on far-right candidate Marine Le Pen in the second-round run-off of France's presidential election yesterday.

Why is it important?

France is the eurozone's secondbiggest economy as well as a global military and diplomatic heavyweight, with veto power as a permanent member of the UN Security Council. The second round has boiled down to a battle between the pro-European, pro-globalization vision of Macron and Le Pen's hostility to the EU and NATO. If Le Pen wins, it would further shake up the West's postwar order, already rattled by Britain's vote to leave the EU and Donald Trump's election to the White House.

President's powers

Directly elected, the French president looms large over the political landscape of the Fifth Republic. He five-year terms and has the final word on all foreign policy.

The president has the power to appoint and replace the prime minister and presides over the cabinet. He or she can propose laws and, with the prime minister, can force them through parliament unless there is a successful no-confidence vote. The French leader has the power to propose a referendum without needing approval from parliament.

As head of the armed forces, he or she has the power to order the use of nuclear weapons. The president is immune from prosecution and has the power to pardon convicted criminals.

How is the president elected?

The president is elected in a direct popular vote of one or two rounds. Yesterday's run-off comes after neither candidate obtained an absolute majority in the first round. Every

French presidential election since 1965 has gone to a second round.

What happened in the first round

Macron won 24 percent of the vote and Le Pen finished second with 21.3 percent as France's traditional left and right parties were eliminated in the first round for the first time since the start of the Fifth Republic in 1958.

How does the election work?

A total of 47.58 million people are registered to vote. The country's 66,546 polling stations opened at 8:00 am (0600 GMT) and most closed at 7:00 pm, while those in Paris and other big cities remained open an hour longer.

What happens next?

The new president will take over from Socialist Francois Hollande and is expected to be sworn in by May 14. — AFP

GERMANS IN FAR NORTH VOTE IN TEST FOR MERKEL RIVALS Social Democrats keen to regain momentum after loss

KIEL, Germany: Germans in the far northern state of Schleswig-Holstein voted in force yesterday in the first of two regional polls the Social Democrats must win if they are to pose a serious challenge to Chancellor Angela Merkel in September's national election. The Social Democratic Party (SPD) enjoyed a revival in the opinion

polls early this year after nominating former European Parliament president Martin Schulz in January as its candidate to run against Merkel.

But the "Schulz effect" failed to deliver in Saarland, where his party flopped in a March state poll. In Schleswig-Holstein, the SPD is defending an incumbent state pre-

mier - Torsten Albig - for the first time since Schulz's nomination as party leader. "Last night we took a trip through lots of bars," a chipper Albig told reporters after voting in Kiel. "I think I only met undecided voters, and I think there is a lot of potential there."

Albig will need to capture the undecided vote. A survey by poll-

ster Forschungsgruppe Wahlen for national broadcaster ZDF published on Thursday put support for Merkel's CDU at 32 percent in his state, ahead of the SPD on 29 percent. Jobs and wind farm plans are among the regional issues in Schleswig-Holstein, a region of 2.3 million voters that juts north of Hamburg and borders Denmark.

"If Torsten Albig wins, whatever the coalition constellation, that will show people that the election in September is open," said Hajo Funke, political scientist at Berlin's Free University.

The state election commissioner in Schleswig-Holstein estimated that by 11 am (0900 GMT), 21.55 percent of eligible voters had cast their vote, up from 17.7 percent at the same stage in the last regional vote in 2012. The SPD's chances of toppling Merkel will be boosted further if they can hold onto power next Sunday in North Rhine-Westphalia (NRW), a large western region where elections in the past have served as an indicator of the national mood.

BRITAIN'S LABOR PLEDGES NO TAX **RISE FOR MIDDLE-INCOME EARNERS**

LONDON: Britain's opposition Labor Party said middle and low earners would not face tax hikes to fund its spending plans if it wins next month's election, with the burden falling instead on the top five percent of earners and big business.

Prime Minister Theresa May's

"Jeremy Corbyn will have to raise taxes because his nonsensical economic ideas don't add up and he'll make a mess of the Brexit negotiations," said chief secretary to the Treasury David Gauke.

The BBC's Andrew Marr put it to McDonnell, who like Corbyn is on the far left of the Labour Party, that he would be

6,000 MIGRANTS RESCUED IN MEDITERRANEAN IN TWO DAYS

ROME: Some 6,000 migrants hoping to head to Europe were rescued in the Mediterranean on Friday and Saturday in dozens of frantic operations coordinated by the Italian coastquard.

Some 3,000 were picked up Saturday by the navy, coastguard, EU border agency Frontex and several NGOs, the coastguard said in a statement. Some of them have already been taken to shore in Italy while others, including 730 onboard a ship operated by Doctors Without Borders (MSF), were on their way. The Libyan coastguard told AFP it had picked up around 170 migrants off Tripoli on Saturday, but had failed to rescue others "due to a lack of means".

The rescues came a day after around 3,000 others were found floating in rubber boats and on makeshift rafts after having left Libya, heading towards Italy.

The International Organization for Migration meanwhile said fishermen had rescued 371 migrants Friday off the coast of the Libyan town of Zuwara. Italy and Libya have moved to boost cooperation in recent Laura Lanuza says the Golfo Azzurro, a for-

months in order to cut the number of people risking their lives by attempting the dangerous Mediterranean crossing.

The Italian government said in a deal signed with Libya in February that it would offer manpower as well as technical assistance to the Libyan coastguard. Rome said this week that it had delivered two speedboats to Libya at the end of last month, with eight more due by the end of June.

Some 37,000 people, many of them sub-Saharan Africans, have arrived in Italy from Libya since the start of the year-a figure some thirty percent higher than a year earlier, according to the Italian interior ministry. More than 4,500 migrants died or were missing and feared drowned in 2016, and another 1,000 have met the same fate this year.

Over 500 migrants who were trying to cross the Mediterranean in several small boats that were in danger of capsizing have been rescued at sea, a Spanish aid organization said yesterday.

Proactiva Open Arms spokeswoman

mer fishing trawler the group operates, plucked 514 migrants from over a dozen rubber and wooden boats during a 24-hour period from Saturday to yesterday morning. The people rescued were refugees fleeing the war in Syria and migrants from sub-Saharan Africa who had set sail from Libya, according to Lanuza.

The rescue boat was filled to capacity and headed for an Italian port since the weather was turning bad, she said. The Golfo Azzurro was operating as part of an NGO rescue fleet coordinated by the Italian coast guard.

Also yesterday, Spain's maritime rescue service said a rescue boat and helicopter worked together to save three migrants in a small vessel found 4 kilometers (2 1/2 miles) off the Spanish coast. Hundreds of thousands of migrants and refugees have crossed the Mediterranean Sea in smugglers' boats in hopes of a better life in Europe, but thousands die each year trying. Libya is one of the prime launching points. On Saturday, a Spanish navy frigate rescued another 651 migrants off the coast of Libya. —Agencies

UKRAINE BARS RUSSIAN JOURNALISTS ENTRY FOR EUROVISION

KIEV: Ukrainian officials yesterday said they had blocked several Russian journalists who visited the annexed Crimea peninsula from entering the country to cover the Eurovision Song Contest in Kiev.

Border service spokesman Oleg Slobodyan said two unnamed Russian journalists were on Sunday "not allowed across the frontier and banned from entering Ukraine for three years" over visits they made to the Crimea region seized by Moscow.

"The state border service notes that having accreditation for Eurovision does not give you the right to cross the border," Slobodyan wrote on Facebook. Officials said on Saturday they had also banned a Russian state news agency photographer from entering the country for the same reason.

This year's glitzy Eurovision contest-which culminates in the final on May 13 — has been overshadowed by a dispute between foes Ukraine and Russia after Kiev banned Moscow's entrant over a concert she held in Crimea. The spat saw Russia eventually turfed out of the competition after the country's state television refused to broadcast the event in protest. The former Soviet neighbors have been locked in a deep feud since Moscow snatched the Black Sea Crimea peninsula from Kiev in March 2014 after the ouster of

Ukraine's pro-Kremlin leader by protestors.

Russia subsequently backed insurgents who have taken over swathes of the east of the country in a bloody conflict that has cost some 10,000 lives. Ukraine's pro-Western leader Petro Poroshenko on Sunday said that Eurovision would draw international focus to the country as it struggles to break away from Moscow's grip.

"The attention of hundreds of millions of television viewers from the whole world will during these days be riveted on Ukraine, on our Europesan aspirations, on our fight for freedom and for independence," Poroshenko said. —AFP

Conservatives, which have a commanding lead in the polls, have attacked Labor's spending plans, claiming a victory for Jeremy Corbyn's party would lead to more debt and higher taxes. Labor's finance spokesman John McDonnell said he would guarantee no tax rises for five years for all those earning less than 80,000 pounds (\$104,000) if the party were elected.

There would be no hikes in valueadded sales taxes and no changes in national insurance either, he pledged. "Labor is now the party of low taxes for middle and lower earnings," he said in a speech yesterday. However, those earning above that threshold would be asked to pay "a modest bit" more to help fund public services, he said on the BBC's Andrew Marr show.

Businesses would also be asked to stump up to pay for upgrades to Britain's infrastructure, such as high-speed broadband and new railways. "As part of the new settlement, a Labor government will be asking business to contribute its fair share, with the largest companies paying a bit more in tax," he said. The details would be set out in Labor's manifesto published the week after next, he said.

The Conservatives said Labor would have to increase taxes to tackle what they said was a 45-billion-pound black hole in its spending plans.

the first Marxist Labour finance minister.

"I'm going to be the first socialist, in the tradition of the Labour party," McDonnell said.

When asked if he was a Marxist, he replied: "Well I'll tell you - I believe there is a lot to learn from reading (Das) Kapital." The Conservatives jumped on his comment. "The man Jeremy Corbyn wants to make Chancellor (finance minister) believes that the nonsensical ideas of Karl Marx - punitive taxes, closing down businesses and the removal of private property - should be at the heart of Britain's economic policy," said International Development minister Priti Patel.

A commanding lead in opinion polls of up to 19 percentage points, and big gains made by her party in local elections last Thursday, put her on track to increase her majority, but pressure to look beyond Europe and detail her approach to tax and spend policies is mounting. —Reuters

ARMED MAN 'SEXUALLY HARASSED' FEMALE MONITOR IN UKRAINE

KIEV: A female member of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe mission monitoring the conflict in eastern Ukraine was "sexually harassed" by an armed man in rebel territory, the group confirmed yesterday. The OSCE has already limited its patrols in parts of the war-torn east since it sustained its first fatality of the three-year conflict when an American medic was killed in an apparent mine blast last month in the insurgent-controlled area.

A spokeswoman for the organization confirmed to AFP yesterday that the latest incident took place in territory seized from Kiev by Russianbacked separatists. "A man armed with an assault rifle (AK-47) sexually harassed a female patrol member and threatened to stop the patrol from moving east from Petrivske towards Rozdolne until his demands were met," the OSCE said in a statement released late Saturday.

The patrol then "left the area via a different road", it said, without specifying when the incident happened. The unarmed OSCE mission is the only international presence on the ground in Ukraine observing the implementation of a largely-ignored peace deal signed in February 2015.

Ukrainian forces and rebels clash sporadically along the volatile frontline as the conflict which has cost some 10,000 lives since April 2014 rumbles on. Kiev and the West accuse Russia of masterminding and fuelling the conflict, but Moscow denies evidence it has sent troops and weapons across the border. —AFP

NEAR ALL-MALE PANEL IN S KOREA'S PRESIDENTIAL RACE

SEOUL: When Park Geun-Hye was elected South Korea's first female president five years ago she secured the largest-ever vote share of the country's democratic era. But after her term ended in impeachment and disgrace only one of the 13 candidates to succeed her is a woman.

Analysts say the near all-male panelepitomized by rows of campaign posters dominated by middle-aged men in dark suits-demonstrates the enduringly patriarchal nature of Korean society.

The only exception is Sim Sang-Jeung, a former labor activist who is the leftwing Justice Party's candidate. Park-the daughter of the late dictator Park Chung-Heewas ousted from power in March over a massive corruption and influence-peddling scandal centred on a secret female confidante that prompted millions to take to the streets calling for her ouster. She is now detained and awaiting trial for charges including abuse of power and bribery, and the public outrage unleashed a storm of sexist remarks online such as: "Don't even dream about having a female president for the next 100 years.

Sim condemns what she calls a sexual double standard, saying no one took issue with the gender of two previous presidents-both men-who were imprisoned in the 1990s for their part in crushing the Gwangju Uprising against the military-backed dictatorship. "We had two other ex-presidents jailed for slaughtering

countless citizens who were protesting against army rule. But not a single person said, 'No more male presidents'" she said in a campaign speech.

Park is a conservative who did little for women's rights while in office, and female politicians struggling with the glass ceiling say her humiliating downfall has done nothing to help. "I've seen recently many male voters, or even male politicians, saying, 'This is why women should never be in politics," said Han Jeoung-Ae, a two-term lawmaker with the centre-left Democratic Party. "We have no shortage of male politicians brought down by corruption and other crimes, but no one ever frames it as the failure of entire male politicians like they do over women," she told AFP.

Glass ceiling

Female politicians are still a relative rarity in the South, accounting for only 17 percent of parliamentary representatives, ranking it 30th among the 35 advanced nations of the OECD. That is an advance on the six percent of 2000, but it is still "extremely hard" for female politicians to secure electoral nominations, said Nam In-Soon, a Democratic lawmaker, who is pushing for parties to be legally obliged to select women as at least 30 percent of their candidates.

"We have made some progress over the years, but most internal networking within a political party's leadership is still based on the good old boys' club," she told AFP. "We still have this hard, thick glass ceiling all over our head." Park herself rose to power largely due to the popularity of her father, who remains widely revered by older voters who benefited from rapid growth under his 1961-79 iron-fisted rule. South Korea remains a deeply conservative society in many respects and, along with Japan, is seen as one of the worst places for working women among economically advanced nations. The two Asian neighbors were this year ranked at the bottom of the Economist's "Glass Ceiling index", which measures gender equality at work among 29 advanced nations.

'Superwoman Prevention'

Sim has no chance of victory at the

ballot box, with South Korea's leading pollsters both putting her in fourth place in the final surveys of the campaign, on 7.3 percent according to Realmeter and eight percent for Gallup Korea, far behind Democratic Party front-runner Moon Jae-In. But the 58-year-old scored well in debates and was the most vocal critic of Hong Joon-Pyo, the candidate of Park's conservative Liberty Korea Party, who is known as "Korea's Trump" for his outspoken rhetoric and sexist remarks and has been polling third. Hong, 62, drew fire for saying "washing dishes is women's work" in an interview, and for bragging in his memoir about helping a college friend with an attempted date rape by drugging a woman.

Sim targeted him repeatedly during a television debate until he forced out an apology. Sim is pushing for measures to help working mothers faced with the double burdens of employment and household duties, dubbed "Superwoman Prevention Laws", and rules to make half the cabinet women.

'The current reality faced by female politicians still looks bleak," said Lee Jin-Ock, head of Korea Women's Politics Solidarity think tank. But Sim offers a ray of hope as a "new female leader who climbs the political ladder on her own terms", she said, "unlike Park who symbolizes the patriarchal, patronage politics of the past". — AFP

PAKISTAN ARMY KILLS 50 AFGHAN SECURITY FORCES IN BORDER FIGHT

Afghan families flee as Taleban take key northern district

has destroyed at least five Afghan checkpoints near the border between the two countries, killing about 50 security forces. Maj Gen Nadeem Ahmad told reporters yesterday at the Chaman border crossing that two of his soldiers were also killed and another nine were wounded. The Pakistani and Afghan armies have been clashing at the border crossing in southwestern Baluchistan province since Friday.

Officials in Islamabad say the fighting began after Afghan security forces fired on Pakistani census workers and the troops escorting them, killing nine civilians and wounding 42, including

QUETTA, Pakistan: The Pakistani army says it women and children. Pakistan and Afghanistan routinely accuse each other of providing sanctuaries to their enemy insurgents - which both sides deny. Hundreds of Afghan families have fled fighting between the Taleban and government forces near the northern city of Kunduz as the insurgents captured a strategic district soon after launching their annual spring offensive. The militants began their assault on the Qala-e-Zal district in Kunduz province on Saturday and captured most of it including the district centre. The attack triggered intense fighting with government forces that sent civilians fleeing toward the provincial capital of Kunduz. The Norwegian

Refugee Council, which has offices in Kunduz, said in a statement that some families were forced to sleep in the open while others moved into the homes of relatives.

"Around 2.30 am Taleban fighters came to our houses and asked us to evacuate. They told us not to make any sound. We were all afraid," said Abdul Karim, 31 who fled Qala-e Zal with his family to Kunduz city, according to the statement. "Taleban fighters were shooting from one side of our house and the Afghan National Security Forces from the other side. A rocket landed in my garden. My wife told me that if I didn't flee, she would leave the house alone with our two daughters," said another resident, 29year-old Rahman Gerdi. Mahfuzullah Akbari, a government spokesman, said Afghan forces retreated from the district to avoid civilian casualties while a Taleban spokesman said in a statement they had forced them out.

"We have launched an operation to retake the district," Akbari told AFP. On April 28 the Taleban launched their "spring offensive", heralding a surge in fighting as the US tries to craft a new Afghan strategy and NATO considers sending more troops to break the stalemate against the resurgent militants. The annual spring offensive normally marks the start of the fighting season, though this winter the Taleban continued to battle government forces. An attack on a military base in the neighboring city of Mazar-i-Sharif left at least 135 soldiers dead earlier last month. The militants also claimed to have captured Sangin district in the volatile southern province of Helmand in March, underscoring their growing strength. The Taleban briefly seized Kunduz city in September 2015 in their biggest victory since they were toppled from national power by a US-led invasion in 2001. They were able briefly to re-enter the city centre in October 2016 before once again being pushed back. —Agencies

PHILIPPINES SAYS BOMB SPARKED BY FEUD BUT IS CLAIMS ATTACK

MANILA, Philippines: A bomb explosion that killed two people in a Muslim community in Manila was sparked by a personal feud, Philippine police officials said yesterday, but the Islamic State group claimed its fighters were responsible.

have been killed and six others injured by detonating an explosive device by the Islamic State fighters in central Manila."

The death toll differed from details released by the police and other officials in Manila. There have been fears of the Sunni-Shiite violence spreading to the largely Roman Catholic Philippines, home to minority Muslims who are mostly Sunnis in the country's south. A Shiite center was bombed in the south in 2015 and two local Shiites were killed in an attack near Manila that same year. A pipe bomb also exploded in Quiapo on April 28 while President Rodrigo Duterte's administration was hosting an annual ministerial meeting of The Association of Southeast Asian Nations in a convention center a few kilometers (miles) away. Albayalde and other police officials said the April 28 blast was triggered by a gang feud and unrelated to Saturday night's bombing. Police, backed by a SWAT contingent, early Friday raided the house of a suspect in that explosion and found materials to be used for two more pipe bombs, along with shotgun ammunition and electrical bomb parts. The suspect, who was only identified as Saro, was not in the house in Manila, according to a police report. The bombings came amid ongoing military offensives against the Abu Sayyaf and other groups, which have pledged allegiance to the IS group. —AP

servants have long been one of the most reliable vote banks for Prime Minister Najib Razak's ruling coalition, but as he prepares to seek re-election he faces warnings that soaring living costs risk eroding that support.

Prices have risen sharply since Malaysia cut state subsidies and launched a national goods and services (GST) tax to plug a hole in its finances caused by falling oil and gas revenues, and rank-and-file government workers say they are feeling the pinch. "My wife earns some side income doing freelance work, but we just can't save," said 28-year-old Mohd Nizam, who has supported Najib's United Malays National Organisation (UMNO) in the past but, like around a dozen public sector workers who spoke to Reuters, did not want to say if he would do so again.

"I don't know how we'll manage if we have a child," said Nizam, who rides a motorcycle to work each day in the administrative capital Putrajaya, where he earns 3,000 ringgit (\$687) a month as a government clerk. Rising prices were a key factor that prompted urban and non-Malay voters to abandon the coalition led by UMNO over the past two elections.

But UMNO clung on to its rural Malay Muslim heartlands and the votes of rank-and-file civil servants - most of whom are ethnic Malays due to a decades-old positive discrimination policy that gives them priority for government jobs.

The next election is not due until 2018 but, after facing down a corruption scandal at state developer 1 Malaysia Development Berhad (1MDB), Najib is expected to capitalize on opposition disarray and call an election this year.

Analysts expect Najib to win, but he has little room for manoeuvre. In 2013 the UMNO-led Barisan Nasional (BN) coalition lost the popular vote but won most seats in parliament - if its majority were further eroded this time Najib could face an internal leadership challenge.

Rizalman Mokhtar, a grassroots leader with UMNO, said he feared civil servants - who make up around 15 percent of all voters could turn against the party if nothing is done about the rising cost of living. "We have to

Deeper debt

Malaysia's annual inflation hit an eight-year high of 5.1 percent in March, among the quickest in Southeast Asia and far outpacing Singapore, Indonesia, the Philippines and Thailand.

INDIA'S ANTI-GRAFT CRUSADER FACES BRIBERY ALLEGATION


NEW DELHI: Anticorruption crusader Arvind Kejriwal's government in the Indian capital plunged into a crisis yesterday as a minister he fired over the weekend accused him of accepting 20 rupees million

(\$300,000) in cash as Arvind Kejriwal a bribe. There was no immediate comment from Kejriwal. His Aam Admi Party spokesman, Kumar Viswas, rejected the allegation by party lawmaker Kapil Mishra, describing it as an attack by rivals. "We don't want to give any credence to such wild allegations," said Ashish Khaitan, another party leader.

Mishra told reporters that in his presence, Kejriwal accepted the cash from another colleague and minister, Satyendra Jain, at his New Delhi residence on Friday. He said that Jain later told him that the money was paid in connection with a land deal worth 500 million rupees (\$760,000).

Mishra said he met Kejriwal on Saturday and asked him to explain the source of money to all party lawmakers but was fired. He said that Kejriwal told him that "such things happen in politics" and he would explain it later.

Mishra said he would meet officials of



The BJP is in opposition in the state legislature. Kejriwal launched the Aam Aadmi Party in 2012, and it won the Delhi state legislature election a year later, when he became the chief minister. Kejriwal, a 48-year-old former civil servant, campaigned to rid the Indian political system and governance of corruption and inefficiency.

The party's symbol - a broom- and its promise to sweep the administration of graft struck a chord with Delhi residents fed up with venal politicians, runaway inflation and slowing economic growth. The Congress party has been blamed for widespread corruption. But he resigned as the chief minister 49 days later because his minority government couldn't enact an anti-corruption law due to a lack of support from other political parties.

He took over as the chief minister for a second five-year term in 2015 after his party's stunning victory in the state elections when it grabbed 67 of 70 seats. However, his party seems to be losing the steam as it failed to win recent state legislature elections in northern Punjab state and western Goa state. — AP

"France is sending... an incredible message of hope to the world," veteran centrist Francois Bayrou, an ally of Macron, told France 2 television. "Anyone who bet on this has probably made a fortune."

Le Pen, 48, had portrayed the ballot as a contest between Macron and the "globalists" - in favor of open trade, immigration and shared sovereignty - and her "patriotic" vision of strong borders and national identities. In a short statement, Le Pen said she had called Macron to wish him "success" in tackling the "huge challenges" he faced and announced that she would lead the FN into June's parliamentary elections.

Macron will now face huge challenges as he attempts to enact his domestic agenda of cutting state spending, easing labor laws, boosting education in deprived areas and extending new protections to the self-employed. The philosophy and literature lover is inexperienced, has no political party and must try to fashion a working parliamentary majority after legislative elections next month.

His En Marche movement - "neither of the left, nor right" - has vowed to field candidates in all 577 constituencies, with half of them women and half of them newcomers to politics. "In order for us to act, we will need a majority in the National Assembly," the secretary general of En Marche, Richard Ferrand, told the TF1 channel, adding that only "half of the journey" had been completed. Many analysts are sceptical about Macron's ability to win a majority with En Marche candidates alone, meaning he might have to form a coalition of lawmakers committed to his agenda.

Furthermore, his economic agenda, particularly plans to weaken labor regulations to fight stubbornly high unemployment, are likely to face fierce resistance from trade unions and his leftist opponents. He also inherits a country which is still in a state of emergency following a string of Islamist-inspired attacks since 2015 that have killed more than 230 people.

The vote yesterday followed one of the most unpredictable election campaigns in modern history marked by scandal, repeated surprises and a last-minute hacking attack on Macron. Hundreds of thousands of emails and documents stolen from his campaign were dumped online on Friday and then spread by anti-secrecy group WikiLeaks, leading the candidate to call it an attempt at 'democratic destabilization''.

France's election authority said publishing the documents could be a criminal offence, a warning flouted by Macron's opponents and far-right activists online. It was the latest twist in an election that has consistently wrong-footed observers as angry voters chose to eject establishment figures, including one-time favorite Francois Fillon, a rightwing ex-prime minister. Unpopular President Francois Hollande was the first to bow to the rebellious mood in December as he declared he would be the first sitting president not to seek re-election in the French republic, founded in 1958.

In the first round of the presidential election on April 23, Macron topped the vote with 24.01 percent, followed by Le Pen on 21.30 percent, in a crowded field of 11 candidates. The results revealed Macron was favored among wealthier, better educated citizens in cities, while Le Pen drew support in the countryside as well as poverty-hit areas in the south and rustbelt northeast. — AFP

But they could fast-track the process by buying into the 1,476-unit complex in Jersey City, scheduled to break ground in early 2018.

The investment drive, hosted by Chinese governmentapproved immigration agency QWOS, has sought to highlight the project's connections to the "famous" clan, raising concern over potential conflicts of interest. Yesterday, Meyer was introduced in Chinese to investors as a representative of "a famed celebrity investment family". QWOS representatives courting potential investors on-site pointedly dropped the name of Trump's daughter Ivanka, who is Jared Kushner's wife and a popular icon on the mainland.

Attendees were reassured by an American lawyer that despite his tough talk on immigration, Trump himself was a key decision-maker for EB-5 policy and was unlikely to make any changes to it in the near future - making it a safe path to US residency. But acting sooner was better than later since investment thresholds were likely to rise come autumn and regulations tighten, he warned.

The housing complex, known as "One Journal Square", will include recreational facilities, child playrooms and a pet hospital, according to the QWOS website. EB-5 investment from China will account for around 15 percent of its

total \$976.4 million cost. The Chinese company's advertisements for the Journal Square development described the project as "Kushner 1", with punchy subtitles declaring that it has "government support" and is "founded by celebrity developers," without elaborating. Bi Ting, a 34-year-old woman who attended the Shanghai event, said having the name of the US president's son-in-law associated with it was "a bonus for the project".

Yesterday's presentations emphasized the complex's similarity to a Trump-branded luxury development a tenminute drive away. Those apartments were also developed by Kushner Companies, and about a quarter of the funding - around \$50 million - was obtained via EB-5 investment, according to a report last year by Bloomberg News. Most investors were Chinese and were brought in by QWOS, the company said.

Around a dozen clients had signed on for the new project after a Beijing event headed by Meyer the day before, QWOS representatives told AFP. There, Nicole Kushner Meyer told investors that the project "means a lot to me and my entire family", and mentioned her brother's former role as chief executive of Kushner Companies, the New York Times reported. Photos of the meeting showed promotional posters bearing the slogan: "Government supports it; Celebrity property developer builds it". — Agencies

HOW DRUGMAKERS FACE PUSHBACK OVER HIGH PRICES

Focus

Pharmaceutical companies are under fire around the world as a wave of new treatments for cancer and other serious conditions reach the market at ever rising prices, and the pressure looks set to increase. This week the debate on drug pricing - a particularly heated topic in the United States - will move to Amsterdam as the Dutch government hosts a forum for World Health Organization (WHO) member states to promote "fair pricing".

After Donald Trump earlier this year accused drugmakers of "getting away with murder", shortly before he was inaugurated as US president, the May 11 event underscores the focus on medicine pricing in health ministries from Berlin to Beijing. In Europe, Germany's tough price negotiators have caused some firms to pull drugs off the market rather than accept price cuts, while Britain last month introduced new budget curbs on pricey products.

China and Japan, the two biggest non-Western markets for pharmaceuticals, are also bearing down on costs, and poorer countries find new drugs costing tens of thousands of dollars are simply out of reach, even with preferential pricing deals. "It's great that we have these treatments but we need to find a way to make them more affordable," Andrew Rintoul, the WHO health economist organizing the drug pricing forum, told Reuters.

Drugmakers know they must up their game to save their reputation - even as patients cheer the scientific advances behind their new products - and the industry is fighting to defend its corner more vigorously than ever. A major advertising campaign by the US Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America trade group, for example, includes accusations that insurers are failing to pass on the benefits of discounts negotiated with manufacturers.

This goes to the heart of a thorny issue. On the surface, the cost of medicines may be rising steeply but the picture is distorted by off-invoice discounts and rebates, which in the United States average around 30 percent, according to healthcare information firm QuintilesIMS. In Europe, such rebates amount to roughly 17 percent. "I personally don't believe in the talk of drug expenditure breaking the system," Thomas Cueni, who recently took over as director-general of the International Federation of Pharmaceutical Manufacturers and Associations, told Reuters. "When you look at the aggregate numbers, drug spending has been pretty stable in most OECD countries at around 10 to 15 percent of healthcare spending."

favored status, there's some skepticism about whether he's for workers or just the executives who hire them. Trump got some boos and hisses during his address to the building trades union. And Chuck Jones, president of United Steelworkers Local 1999, with whom Trump feuded, raises an eyebrow at the talk coming from the White House. "I don't think from our perspective, he's a friend of the working class person," Jones said, noting that Trump's tax plan would benefit the president himself, and that Trump campaigned on "getting rid" of a long-standing free trade deal with Canada and Mexico. "Trump always had some kind of relationship with the building trades. But for regular manufacturing? This is not a good time for working people."

During his first 100 days, Trump has tried to appeal to those frustrated by seeing US jobs go overseas. For example, he scrapped US plans to participate in an Asia-Pacific trade pact and belittled the North American Free Trade Agreement, although he backed away from a campaign pledge to withdraw from it.


He's taken to Twitter to criticize American companies with plans to move some operations to other countries and threatened to tax any products they tried to sell in the US He's pushed a reluctant Republican-controlled Congress to pay for a \$1 trillion rebuilding of the nation's roads and bridges, and he's green-lighted the Keystone XL pipeline.

But while some unions have received the red carpet treatment, others have been largely ignored at the White House. Take teachers unions, traditional allies of Democrats. While Education Secretary Betsy DeVos joined Trump for White House sessions with teachers and other educators, neither of the two big teachers unions — the National Education Association and the American Federation of Teachers was invited. DeVos did accept an invitation from AFT President Randi Weingarten to tour a school in Ohio. stop the Republicans in Congress from trying to take out the protections for prevailing wage," she said. "Is he actually going to have enough money in there for projects?"

Trump is picking and choosing among labor unions at a vulnerable time for the movement in American politics. Union membership declined 240,000 in one year to 10.7 percent of the workforce in 2016, about half as much as when the Census Bureau began collecting such statistics in 1983. "There are some unions that, in fact, he has gone after. Teachers come to mind. Government employees come to mind," said the AFL-CIO's Richard Trumka, referring to the president's pledges to close or slash spending for the Department of Education and efforts to shrink the federal workforce.

Trump is starting with what he knows, and where labor is concerned, that means building trades go to the top of the list. "Did you ever think you'd see a president who knows how much concrete and rebar you can lay down in a single day?" he said at their conference last month. "We're a nation of builders, and it was about time we had a builder in the White House." This president, said Gary N Chaison, a labor historian at Clark University, "knows very well from his old days working in the hotel industry in Manhattan that it's important to get along with the construction unions." — AP

Still, the lack of price transparency is a major bugbear for policy experts like the WHO's Rintoul, who previously negotiated on pharmaceutical prices for the Australian government. Public sector officials see the obscurity surrounding prices as a big obstacle in efforts to negotiate effectively with pharmaceutical companies. There are also growing calls for greater disclosure on companies' R&D and production costs.

Transparency will be high on the agenda in Amsterdam, mirroring efforts by some US states to shine a light on costs. Vermont last year became the first such state to demand that companies justify drug price hikes by detailing factors behind the increase. Companies, however, are reluctant to specify exactly how they come up with drug prices and prefer to stress the value that their medicines bring to patients and society. "The industry has to stand up and argue its value proposition," said Cueni, who admits he is "apprehensive" about the tone of the WHO meeting. "I'm not a big fan of this term 'fairness' because, let's face it, fairness is in the eye of the beholder. There's no objective definition."

Drugmakers like Novartis and Takeda Pharmaceutical, which recently joined with the World Economic Forum to pilot schemes that will pay for drugs based on how well they work, would much rather the focus was on outcomes. But an expensive medicine that may be cost-effective, based on a particular methodology, can still prove to be unaffordable within limited national healthcare budgets. That has been the experience in many countries recently with highly effective new hepatitis C drugs from Gilead and others.

At the other end of the spectrum, the WHO meeting will also try to address the problem of shortages of some off-patent generic medicines, which should be cheap in principle but can hit supply problems if prices fall to unsustainably low levels. As well as tackling expensive drugs, some experts therefore believe minimum prices may be needed to keep certain vital products on the market. — Reuters

AS TRUMP WOOS XI, DALAI LAMA HAS TO WAIT

When Donald Trump was elected in November, the Dalai Lama said he was keen to meet the incoming US president, but since then Trump has cozied up to China's leader Xi Jinping, making it less likely the man Beijing deems a separatist will get an invite to the White House anytime soon. The United States has long recognized Tibet as part of the People's Republic of China, and does not back Tibetan independence. But that has not deterred all the recent US presidents before Trump from meeting the exiled Tibetan spiritual leader.

The United States is widely seen as the last major Western power that has still held meetings with the Dalai Lama despite Beijing's objections that such encounters foment separatism. In past meetings, the US had consistently voiced support for the protection of human rights of Tibetans in China, and called for formal talks between Beijing and the Dalai Lama and his representatives.

At a regular press briefing in Beijing on Friday, China's foreign ministry spokesman Geng Shuang reiterated that China resolutely opposes any foreign country allowing the Dalai Lama to visit or any foreign official having any form of exchange with him. He did not

say whether China had specifically requested Trump not meet the Dalai Lama. A US State Department spokeswoman and a White House official referred Reuters to the Dalai Lama's office when asked whether the Tibetan spiritual leader and his representatives had asked for a meeting with Trump and whether any such meetings were planned. "His Holiness was

supposed to go (to the US) in April, but it was postponed," Lobsang Sangay, head of the Tibetan government-inexile, told Reuters. That trip has been delayed until June due to a hectic schedule in the preceding months that had left the Dalai Lama physically exhausted, Sangay said, adding that Washington DC wouldn't be part of the June itinerary. The office of the Dalai Lama hasn't reached out to Trump to arrange a meeting yet, he said.

The Dalai Lama is taking a more considered approach with regard to any meeting with Trump, said a source with knowledge of the thinking of the winner of the 1989 Nobel Peace Prize. The unpredictable US president upset protocol in December when weeks before being sworn into office he took a telephone call from the leader of self-ruled Taiwan, which China regards as a renegade province, only to last week rebuff Taiwanese suggestions of another call.

In the interim, Trump has met and phoned Xi, and says he has built a strong relationship with the Chinese leader. He called Xi "a friend of mine" who was "doing an amazing job as a leader" in an interview with Reuters last week, and praised him for trying to rein in nuclear-armed North Korea. In return, the Chinese president has invited Trump to visit China this year.

In mid-2008, then British Prime Minister Gordon Brown met the Dalai Lama, to the anger of Beijing. Months later, the British Foreign Secretary at that time David Miliband ditched Britain's near century-long position on Tibet, describing it as an "anachronism", and explicitly recognized Tibet as part of China. Based on treaties signed at the turn of the 20th century by British-administered India and Tibet, Britain had previously said it would recognize China's "special position" in Tibet on the condition that Tibet was given significant autonomy.

Silence from Trump

Chinese troops took control of Tibet in 1950 in what Beijing calls a "peaceful liberation". Nine years later, the Dalai Lama fled to India after an abortive uprising and set up a government in exile, which China does not recognize. China sees the Dalai Lama as a dangerous separatist in a monk's robes, even though the Dalai Lama says he wants autonomy for his homeland, not outright independence. There have been no formal talks between Beijing and the Dalai Lama's representatives since 2010.

International rights groups and exiles say China stamps on the religious and cultural rights of Tibetans, accusations denied by Beijing. China says its rule has ended serfdom and brought prosperity to a once-backward trans-Himalayan region. Trump has

been silent on Tibetan issues. "The main change is that the US approach on Tibet seems

likely to become more transactional and therefore less consistent," said Robbie Barnett, director of the Modern Tibetan Studies Program at Columbia University. "It seems set to become more a question of contingency, dependent on how he calculates his relationship with China at any one moment." Reuters

SHANGHAI SIPG DENY CLAIMS HULK PUNCHED RIVAL COACH


HONG KONG: Brazilian striker Hulk has been accused of punching the coach of a rival team on Saturday because he "despises the Chinese people", a claim his club Shanghai SIPG denied after their latest win in the Chinese Super League. Hulk, who joined SIPG from Zenit St Petersburg in an Asian record deal worth 55 million euros (\$60.47 million) in June last year, allegedly punched Guizhou Zhicheng assistant coach Yu Ming at halftime during his side's 3-0 win. SYDNEY: Olympic silver medalist Madeline Groves and two other Australian Olympic swimmers are facing possible two-year bans for missing drug tests, reports said yesterday. Groves, two-time Olympian Thomas Fraser-Holmes and Rio Olympic open water swimmer Jarrod Poort missed three drug tests in a 12-month period, the Sunday Telegraph reported. Swimming Australia said it was informed by the Australian Sport Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA) and the sport's world governing body FINA that some team members may have failed to update their whereabouts. "ASADA and FINA are yet to finalize their processes and to confirm the final outcomes in relation to these matters," SA said in a statement. "Under ASADA and FINA rules, Swimming Australia is unable to announce details on any individual swimmers who may have failed to update their whereabouts appropriately until ASADA and FINA have completed their process." Athletes are required to keep their whereabouts updated for the purpose of drug testing. —AFP

ALWAYS DREAMING WINS 143RD KENTUCKY DERBY

LOS ANGELES: Always Dreaming won the 143rd Kentucky Derby on Saturday, pulling away in the final straight on a sloppy track at Churchill Downs in Louisville to claim the first jewel in US flat racing's Triple Crown. The triumph gave both jockey John Velazquez and trainer Todd Pletcher a second Kentucky Derby victory, but their first together. Pletcher saddled 2010 Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver, while Velazquez was aboard 2011 winner Animal Kingdom.

"It means a lot," Velazquez said of winning with Pletcher, the trainer he has teamed with so successfully over the years. "We have so much success in the past and we haven't won the Derby (together). Finally we got it together with this horse-incredible horse." Lookin at Lee finished second from the first post with Battle of

Between them, he and Velazquez were twofor-63 in the fabled race that kicks off the coveted treble completed by the Preakness and Belmont Stakes. "You know, there has been a lot of talk about our Derby record," an emotional Pletcher said. "We were hoping for another one, and this one is all the more sweet." Thanks to support from the bettors-based on a stellar showing in the Florida Derby on April 1 and strong workouts since-Always Dreaming was sent off at 9-2 and became the fifth straight betting favorite to win the Kentucky Derby.

Under Velazquez, he broke well from the fifth post and was always near the front. State

of Honor set the early pace, with Battle of Midway and Irish War Cry near the lead. Always Dreaming hit the front going into the final turn. He withstood a challenge from Irish War Cry before pulling away in the straight to leave the late charging Lookin At Lee, a 33-1 shot trained by Steve Asmussen and ridden by Corey Lanerie, to finish second 2 3/4 lengths behind. Battle of Midway, trained by Jerry Hollendorfer and riden by Flavien Prat, held on for third at 40-1.

"Todd and I talked about it-just make sure you come out running and get a position you would like to have," Velazquez said of his intentions for his relatively inexperienced mount. "Once he got a comfortable position on the turn with the other horses I went to the outside. He got into the bridle beautiful in the backstretch. From then on we sat there until the quarter pole when I asked him to run." Pletcher admitted to a few anxious moments during the race. "I was a little worried on the back side. I thought a couple of times he wasn't completely in the bridle," Pletcher said. "But I could tell Johnny was riding him very confidently."

REALLY RUNNING

Pletcher also noticed Irish War Cry's jockey Rajiv Maragh peek under his shoulder as they headed into the stretch "like he thought he had a lot of horse". By that time, Velazquez said, he knew any challengers were "going to have to run really hard to get him, because he was really running." Classic Empire, winner of the 2016 Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the morning line favorite, was jostled at the start. He raced wide in the middle of the 20-horse field down the backstretch and rallied to finish fourth. Irish War Cry, sent off as co-favorite at 9-2, faded to finish 10th.

It was yet another Kentucky Derby disappointment for the Godolphin stables of Dubai ruler Sheikh Mohammed Al-Maktoum as their UAE Derby winner, Thunder Snow, broke awkwardly from the gate and was pulled up by Belgian jockey Christophe Soumillon. An initial examination indicated no serious injury to the horse. The US racing world's attention now turns to the Preakness at Pimlico in Baltimore on May 20. The Triple Crown concludes with the Belmont Stakes in New York on June 10. American Pharoah became just the 12th horse to complete the treble in 2015 and the first since Affirmed in 1978.— AFP



INDIA TO TAKE PART IN CHAMPIONS TROPHY

BCCI UNHAPPY WITH REVENUE SHARE FROM ICC

NEW DELHI: India confirmed their participation in next month's Champions Trophy in England and Wales yesterday after initially delaying the announcement of their squad over a revenue sharing disagreement with cricket's governing body. The dispute intensi fied when India failed to submit a squad for the one-day international tournament by an April 25 deadline after its cricket board (BCCI) was unable to stall a new income model being adopted by the International Cricket Council (ICC). "The Board unanimously authorized the acting honorary secretary of the BCCI to continue negotiations with the ICC in the best interest of the BCCI while keeping its legal options open," the BCCI said after a special general meeting. "The BCCI... unanimously decided that the Indian cricket team will participate in the upcoming ICC Champions Trophy. "The all-India senior selection meeting will be held tomorrow, May 8, in New Delhi to pick the team." At last month's ICC meetings, the BCCI was outvoted 13-1 in its bid to halt the revised deal which considerably slashes India's share from global events in the 2015-23 cycle. Unimpressed by the \$293 million forecast, down from the \$570 million it would have received under a 2014 arrangement, the BCCI responded by refusing to name a squad for the June 1-18 eight-team competition. Acting BCCI secretary Amitabh Choudhary will now continue to negotiate with the world governing body to get a bigger share of ICC revenues during the next eight-year cycle. "The ICC welcomes the unanimous decision from the BCCI special general meeting this morning to confirm the participation of defending champions India in next month's Champions Trophy," the ICC said in a statement to Reuters. "The hundreds of millions of cricket fans around the world just want to see good cricket and now we can all look forward to a superb event in England and Wales starting on 1 June." The option to boycott the event by revoking the Members Participation Agreement (MPA) between the ICC and the BCCI had been gaining traction within the board prior to Sunday's meeting despite a number of former players opposing any withdrawal. The four Supreme Court-appointed administrators (COA), who currently supervise BCCI operations, however, instructed the board to ensure the team continued their preparations to defend their title. The COA stepped in to try and end the dispute with the panel also meeting BCCI members on Saturday to remind them that a confrontational approach would not be in the board's interests. "We wanted them to take a middle ground and strive for a negotiated outcome with the ICC," a COA source said. "We are glad that we have achieved that and the team will play in the Champions Trophy." The top eight sides in the world rankings compete in the Champions Trophy with India winning the last edition in 2013.— Reuters

ALVAREZ PUMMELS CHAVEZ IN LOPSIDED VICTORY

LOS ANGELES: Saul "Canelo" Alvarez cruised to a unanimous decision over Julio Chavez Jr in a 12-round mismatch Saturday then announced in the ring that his next fight would be against Gennady Golovkin. After crushing Chavez, the World Boxing Organization light middleweight champ said he is set to face middleweight champ Golovkin on September 16. "Golovkin, you are next, my friend. Where are you? It's on," Alvarez said before bringing Golovkin into the T-Mobile Arena ring with him.

Golovkin didn't have to travel far to make the announcement as he watched Alvarez's fight from ringside in Las Vegas. "Congratulations," he told Alvarez. "I feel excited to be part of this big drama show." With his win over Chavez, Alvarez claimed Mexican bragging rights on Cinco de Mayo weekend. "I showed I can move, box and do all those things against a fighter who was bigger," Alvarez said. "He wouldn't throw punches." The 26-year-old Alvarez used Chavez for target practice, landing jabs, hooks and combinations at will as he won every round of the 164-pound (75 kg) fight on all three judges' scorecards.

Chavez, who has a four inch (10 cm) height advantage, was booed during and after the fight by the Vegas crowd. Alvarez

treated the lopsided bout as if it were a sparring session, even standing between rounds for the entire fight. "I never sit down during sparring and it is not necessary there and it wasn't necessary here. I told my corner I wouldn't sit down until it was necessary," Alvarez said. He landed 228 punches to just 71 for Chavez and an incredible 31 percent of his jabs connected as he had his way with former champion Chavez, who has largely made his career off the name of his famous boxing champion father Julio Cesar Chavez Sr.

Alvarez improved to 49-1-1 with his only loss coming against Floyd Mayweather in 2013. There was no title on the line Saturday as Alvarez moved up in weight to fight the much bigger Chavez at a catchweight of 164lbs. Alvarez was the heavy favorite going into the fight and it didn't take long to see why. Chavez had no answer for the punches from Alvarez which often came in combinations of three, four and sometimes even six. Chavez, 31, was bleeding from the left nostril in the fifth round. By the final round, he was bleeding from both nostrils and his left eye was almost swollen shut. He said Alvarez's counterpunches were taking a toll on him. "He beat me. If I attacked more, I would be open for more counterpunches," Chavez said.—AFP

OVECHKIN AND CO BEAT PENGUINS TO STAY ALIVE

WASHINGTON: Alex Ovechkin answered his critics as the Washington Capitals scored two third period goals just 27 seconds apart to beat the Pittsburgh Penguins 4-2 in game five of their NHL playoff series Saturday. Ovechkin and fellow Russian Evgeny Kuznetsov scored back to back to cap a three goal third period rally and cut the Penguins lead in the Eastern Conference second round series to 3-2. "I knew we were going to come through sooner or later," said Capitals' goaltender Braden Holtby, who made 20 saves. "We are sick of talk and we want to prove we can get it done. We have got to take that mindset into game six." The Penguins will try again to close out the series when it shifts back to Pittsburgh for game six today night.

Andre Burakovsky and Sweden's Nicklas Backstrom also scored for the Capitals, who had been outscored in the series despite peppering Penguins goalie Marc-Andre Fleury with more shots. Fleury stopped 28 shots on Saturday for Pittsburgh who got goals from Carl Hagelin, of Sweden, and American Phil Kessel. The game marked the return of Penguin superstar Sidney Crosby who suffered the fourth concussion of his career when he was crosschecked in the head by Washington defenceman Matt Niskanen.

Crosby took a regular shift, played on special teams and finished with one assist. Questions also surrounded Ovechkin heading into game five as the Russian dynamo struggled in game four and was looking at reduced ice time if he was unable to turn his fortunes around. Ovechkin responded with a superb individual effort to score the Capitals' fourth goal at 7:47 of the third to round out the scoring. He goal came just 27 seconds after Kuznetsov scored to make it 3-2 and give the Capitals their first lead of the contest.

Ovechkin cut across the top of the left faceoff circle and his initial shot was blocked by Ron Hainsey. Ovechkin collected the loose puck and then beat Canada's Fleury high to the glove side. Ovechkin now has two goals and five points in the series. The Penguins pulled their goalie for the extra attacker with over two minutes remaining in the third but were unable to get even one past Holtby.

Senators 5, Rangers 4 (overtime)

Kyle Turris scored at 6:28 of overtime to give the Ottawa Senators a come-from-behind 5-4 victory over the New York Rangers at Canadian Tire Centre on Saturday. The win gives the Senators a 3-2 lead in the best-of-seven Eastern Conference semi-final series that moves to New York for Game 6 on Tuesday. Turris' attempted first shot was blocked by a Rangers defender, but he was able to get control of the loose puck and beat goalie Henrik Lundqvist to end the game.

New York nearly won the contest two minutes earlier as Michael Grabner knocked a pass from Kevin Hayes out of mid-air at 4:12 of overtime. Officials quickly negated the tally on the basis of a high stick. Rangers winger Jimmy Vesey scored his first goal of the playoffs with 7:12 left in regulation to snap a 3-3 deadlock on a play that needed to be reviewed. Vesey dove across the crease to swat at the puck, but it wound up in the trapper of diving goalie Craig Anderson.

However, the replay showed that Anderson's glove was just on the other side of the goal line when he caught the puck. As the extra attacker that jumped on the ice when Anderson rushed to the bench, former Ranger Derick Brassard sent the game into overtime with 1:26 left on the clock. Off a scramble in front of the crease, Brassard batted the puck that went off a couple of Rangers before sliding behind Lundqvist. Jesper Fast, Nick Holden and Ryan McDonagh had the other Rangers goals while Mark Stone, Tom Pyatt and Mike Hoffman scored for the Senators. Lundqvist made 32 saves while Anderson stopped 29 shots.— Agencies

Konta shocked by Siegemund

MADRID: British number one Johanna Konta was knocked out in the Madrid Open first round by Laura Siegemund in the early hours of yesterday in a match that finished after 2 am. With all six scheduled matches on the main Manolo Santana court going the full three sets, the on-form Siegemund, fresh from winning in Stuttgart last week, and sixth seed Konta didn't get on court until just before midnight. Konta appeared to have handled the long wait better as she took the first set 6-3.

However, Siegemund battled back to take her winning streak to six matches, four of which have come against top 10 players, by taking the final two sets 7-5, 6-4. Eugenie Bouchard set up a potential mouth-watering second-round clash with Maria Sharapova by registering her first win on the WTA Tour since January's Australian Open over France's Alize Cornet 6-4, 4-6, 61. Bouchard called Sharapova "a cheater" last week and suggested the Russian should be banned for life after testing positive for meldonium. Sharapova faces Mirjana Lucic-Baroni in the first round on Sunday as the Russian continues her comeback from a 15-month ban. "I hope I can play Maria," said Bouchard.

"Once I step on the court, everything will be to the side. "But, you know, inside myself, I think I'll have a bit more motivation." World number three Karolina Pliskova was the only seed in action on Saturday to survive and even the Czech was pushed hard by Lesia Tsurenko before winning 7-6 (7/5), 2-6, 6-2. Ninth seed Madison Keys was beaten by Japan's Misaki Doi 6-4, 4-6, 6-4. And 12th seed Elena Vesnina's poor form since winning in Indian Wells in March continued with a straight sets 6-4, 6-4 defeat to Romanian Irina Begu.— AFP

CRUSADERS TAME BULLS IN KIWI RAMPAGE

SYDNEY: The Canterbury Crusaders stacked up their 10th-straight win as New Zealand continued on a Super Rugby rampage at the weekend, leaving South African and Australian teams scattered in their wake. The unbeaten seven-time champion Crusaders, even without key All Black forwards Kieran Read and Sam Whitelock, minced South Africa's Northern Bulls 62-24 in Pretoria to hold on to their lead in the fiercely-competitive New Zealand conference. It was the Crusaders' second-biggest victory margin this year after a 50-3 rout of the Japanese Sunwolves. They have totted up 167 points in their last three games, all against South African opposition.

The Christchurch outfit top the New

Zealand standings by four points from the Waikato Chiefs, with defending champions the Wellington Hurricanes a further four points back with a game in hand."We were really fired up for this match as the team has struggled to win at Loftus," skipper and flanker Matt Todd said, referring to the Crusaders' last win in Pretoria nine years ago. "Facing the Bulls, we needed early momentum and achieved that goal. However, our victory was not as easy as the scoreline suggests." It was yet another masterclass from the benchmark Super Rugby team, hammering the hapless Bulls 10 tries to three, prompting local pundits to call for the head of Bulls' coach Nollis Marais.

The Chiefs kept in touch of the high-flying

Crusaders with a bonus-point 46-17 win over the Queensland Reds in New Plymouth, marking the successful return of Charlie Ngatai. Ngatai was out of action for 12 months with concussion issues but showed no sign of rust on his return to join a logjam of talent vying for a start in the All Blacks midfield when the British and Irish Lions arrive next month. There were concussion issues for All Blacks hope Sonny Bill Williams as the Auckland Blues staved off the fast-finishing NSW Waratahs 40-33 in Sydney. Double World Cup-winning centre Williams left the field for a head injury assessment just before half-time and never returned.

LIONS ROAR PAST REBELS

Defending champions Wellington Hurricanes held off a fightback from South Africa's Western Stormers to extend their winning home run to 11 matches. The Hurricanes scored seven tries to one in the 41-22 victory, including two each for Jordie Barrett and Ngani Laumape, to inflict the Stormers' fourthstraight loss. The Otago Highlanders capped a sensational weekend for Kiwi teams with an incredible comeback to squeeze a 45-41 win over the Central Cheetahs in Bloemfontein. Trailing by 17 points in the 76th minute, the Highlanders rushed in three tries to stretch a winning streak to six matches, a feat they last achieved in 2005.

South Africa's red-hot Golden Lions posted their biggest win in Australia with a thumping 47-10 victory over the Rebels in Melbourne. The Johannesburg-based Lions hammered the hapless Rebels seven tries to one for their seventh-straight win and further extended their lead over the Coastal Sharks at the top of the South Africa 2 conference. The yellow-carding of Western Force centre Curtis Rona cost his side dearly as they lost 37-12 to the Sharks in Durban. The Jaguares of Argentina snapped a four-match losing streak with a come-frombehind 46-39 victory over the Sunwolves in Buenos Aires. Australia's ACT Brumbies and South Africa's Southern Kings had byes this weekend.— AFP

AUSTRALIA'S CHIEF DEFENDS NRL AFTER COCAINE SCANDALS

SYDNEY: Australia's National Rugby League chief has defended the game following a series of drug scandals as one of the New Zealand players involved quit his country's Test captaincy. The sport in the past few days has been hit with cocaine-linked allegations involving a club chairman and three leading players in three separate incidents. "Can we do more education? Can we do more testing? We can. We do a hell of a lot of it," NRL chief executive Todd Greenberg told reporters late Saturday. But he defended the code, saying: "I don't think the game's got any bigger problem than what society has on a weekly and daily basis in confronting these sorts of challenges. "We've hundreds of young men inside the rugby league network. We do a huge amount of education, we do a huge amount of testing, we're still going to have issues, we know that. 'That's the realistic nature of the way we do our business. But we're no different than the rest of society." Greenberg's comments came as Gold Coast Titans and Kiwi star Kevin Proctor issued a statement saying he was "extremely embarrassed and sorry" for his actions. Proctor and fellow New Zealand forward Jesse Bromwich were allegedly caught attempting to buy cocaine outside a Canberra nightclub after losing a Test match to Australia on Friday. Bromwich said he would step down as New Zealand Test captain. His club Melbourne Storm announced they would stand him down for two NRL matches and from the club's leadership group. Proctor said the night was "a bit sion in Sydney on Thursday.— AFP

Banning the pair from the New Zealand World Cup squad "could be one of a number of sanctions" to be considered, he added.

The Rugby League World Cup will be held from late October in Australia, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea. The NRL's Integrity Unit was looking into all the allegations, with Greenberg vowing "big consequences" if the cases are proven true. "There must be conseguences for actions and poor decisions ultimately cost people livelihoods in the game," he said. Cronulla Sharks club chairman Damian Keogh stepped aside following his arrest late Friday for alleged drug possession. Sydney Roosters' Kiwi centre Shaun Kenny-Dowall was charged over drug posses-

BUENOS AIRES: Jaguares of Argentina snapped a four-match losing streak with a come-frombehind 46-39 victory over Sunwolves of Japan Saturday in a Super Rugby try fest. The hosts turned a 39-27 deficit 14 minutes from time into a seven-point victory thanks to tries from Matias Alemanno, Agustin Creevy and Matias Moroni. Jaguares scored seven tries and Sunwolves five at Estadio Jose Amalfitani in a lively conclusion to round 11 of the regular season.

Victory left the hosts with a slim chance of making the quarter-finals-they trail Coastal Sharks of South Africa by eight points with five games to play. Sunwolves are playing for pride having won just one of 10 matches, but running Jaguares close in their first visit to Buenos Aires confirmed recent improvement. They arrived in Argentina after finishing a three-match tour of New Zealand with an encouragingly narrow 27-20 loss to twice champions Waikato Chiefs.

"It was not our best performance this season, but we are very happy to have finished so strongly," said Jaguares No 8 and try scorer Leonardo Senatore. "A win is a win and securing four points is most welcome for us after losing four matches in a row, including one at home."We play in Buenos Aires again next weekend, against the Western Force, and Australian teams are very fast, so our preparations must take that into account." Sunwolves' Samoa-born centre Timothy Lafaele said: "Crucial mistakes in the closing stages cost us the match.

"The Jaguares also managed to slow play down at times which did not suit our style of play. "We have a bye next weekend before playing the Sharks and that gives us time to analyse this match and learn from our mistakes." ROBSON SET BENCHMARK FOR ENGLISH MANAGERS ABROAD

LONDON: English football managers should take a leaf out of the late Bobby Robson's book, Manchester United's Jose Mourinho told the Mail yesterday. Mourinho formed a close friendship with Robson-who died in 2009 from cancer-first as his interpreter at Sporting Lisbon and then at Porto whilst at the same time becoming a tactical analyst, the duo's time together peaking at Barcelona.

Mourinho, who later Sunday tackles Arsenal in a pivotal match in the race to finish in the Premier League top four and earn Champions League qualification, spoke to the newspaper as part of the 20th anniversary of Robson coaching Barcelona to a Cup Winners Cup victory over holders Paris Saint-Germain. Robson, who guided England to the 1990 World Cup semi-finals where they lost to the then-West Germany on penalties, was able to adapt to European football, said Mourinho, and handled the fallout of replacing Dutch legend Johan Cruyff at the helm brilliantly.

"Sir Bobby's mentality was to be very open-minded," Mourinho told the newspaper. "He enjoyed living and coaching abroad, meeting different people. "He was humble despite his experience. "He wanted to learn the differences between the leagues and didn't mind asking for advice or asking for help. "He changed and improved through the new experiences. He arrived in Portugal as a 4-4-2 coach when every team there played with lots of people in midfield. "He understood that he needed to change so he became more multi-functional. Even as an older manager."

Mourinho, who said Robson proved a rock when he lost his sister and mother-inlaw in the same year as his daughter was born, said this spirit of adventure and willingness to learn new things by coaching abroad is no longer a characteristic of English managers. "Nowadays it looks to me that English managers either don't like to go abroad or people abroad think English managers are for the English game," said Mourinho. "They haven't had someone to open the door for them in the last decade. "To be honest, I think that myself, (Pep) Guardiola and (Carlo) Ancelotti are guilty of why it's quite trendy to have managers from Portugal or Spain or Italy.

"Obviously the other guys then have to do well to keep it going, Leonardo Jardim at Monaco is doing phenomenal, Antonio Conte at Chelsea, others. "Maybe also in England, they don't have the jobs that give access to the big prizes. If you have a British manager like Tony Pulis and you are at West Bromwich Albion, it is very difficult to win a European Cup." Mourinho, who has gone on to be one of the most successful managers in club football, said it was no surprise that several of the Barcelona side went on to become really successful club coache.

Amongst those are Luis Enrique, who coached Barcelona to the treble in 2015, Guardiola, who led Barcelona to two Champions League triumphs amongst a plethora of other trophies, and Juan Antonio Pizzi, who won the 2016 Copa America with Chile. "When you are intelligent, you learn to drink from every source and Cruyff and (Louis) Van Gaal (who replaced Robson) were also important," Mourinho said. "But Bobby's leadership was phenomenal and that is a very important part of management." Mourinho said Robson had taught him another important lesson. "I would always get really upset after bad results, I am still the same, but Bobby helped me by saying if I thought of the other dressing room, that the other guys are very happy, it makes you feel less sad," said Mourinho.—AFP

GUARDIOLA URGES PLAYERS TO SHOW MORE RUTHLESS STREAK

MANCHESTER: Pep Guardiola says Manchester City are the Premier League's most creative team, but the Spaniard warned his players must show a more ruthless streak despite their 5-0 rout of Crystal Palace. Guardiola's side were in prolific form as they thrashed Palace at Eastlands on Saturday to climb to third place, at least until Liverpool play Southampton. However, it was only City's third win in nine league matches, and their inconsistency this season has left them 12 points adrift of leaders Chelsea with three games to play.

Guardiola believes City would have been worthy champions this season had they been more clinical in front of goal. And he argued that the only time this season that they have created fewer chances than their opponents was at Tottenham in early October, when City lost 2-0. "Maybe I remember one game this season where the opponent create more chances. One at White Hart Lane. The others, no chance," Guardiola said. "We are better than all the other teams. Against Chelsea, we create more chances both here and at Stamford Bridge but in the boxes we are not good.

"We are the best team in the Premier League for creating clear chances. We are the best one. But we are not able to score goals. "The most difficult thing in football, basketball, tennis - in all the sports is that final moment." Without the injured Sergio Aguero, City enjoyed their biggest league victory under Guardiola, with goals from David Silva, Vincent Kompany, Kevin De Bruyne, Raheem Sterling and Nicolas Otamendi.

AMAZING TEAMS

Yet the manager can cite many examples of games where City did not take their chances and suffered as a result, most notably their 4-0 defeat in January at Everton, who scored their goals with their only four shots on target. "In the game against Everton, they arrive four times and we lose 4-0. We arrive more times than any other team," he said. "You see Real Madrid, Barcelona and Juventus, they create enough chances, similar to us, but they score goals. We've miss that this season a lot." City are effectively in a three-way fight with Liverpool and Manchester United for the final two Champions League places.

There is, though, the possibility that all three could still qualify, if United win the Europa League and finish fifth. "Today was important because we are playing for the future of the club," he said. "The Premier League is tough. There are four amazing teams fighting for the final two places. "I hope United can focus on the Europa League and next season we can have five English teams in the Champions League. It will be amazing." Palace manager Sam Allardyce was critical of his players, suggesting that they effectively gifted City the win.

Allardyce's side remain on 38 points after falling to a third successive defeat that kept them from securing their topflight survival. "Defensively we made too many mistakes and they punished us heavily," Allardyce said. "Our recovery from the first goal was good but we fell into the same shape at the start of the second and it was a bit of a capitulation. "All five goals could have been avoided if we had defended properly. That is the biggest disappointment. "Manchester City, normally when they beat you here, produce outstanding skills but we gifted them easy chances to score and they thrashed us."— AFP

LONDON: Blackburn Rovers became the first Premier League champions to drop into the third tier of English football on Sunday whilst Newcastle claimed the Championship title on a nerve-racking final day of the regular season. Wins for another historic club, two-time European champions Nottingham Forest - 3-0 over Ipswich-and Chinese-owned Birmingham City, who beat Bristol City 1-0, condemned Rovers, owned by Indian poultry firm Venkys, to the drop. Rafael Benitez-managed Newcastle did what they had to do beating Barnsley 3-0 but it took a howler from Brighton goalkeeper David Stockdale to ensure they returned to the top flight as champions.

Brighton-who started the day a point ahead of Newcastle-looked to be heading to a 1-0 win over Aston Villa until Stockdale somehow failed to prevent Jack Grealish's long range effort going into the net and the Seagulls were held 1-1. Blackburn at least departed with a 3-1 win over Brentford but that was little consolation as they contemplate League One and third tier football for the first time since 1980.

"We gave it everything we had today. It is a really disappointed day because we gave it absolutely everything," Rovers midfielder Jason Lowe told Sky Sports. "We knew if we won today we still didn't know what it would mean."

Things had looked extremely rosy for Rovers early on as they stormed into a 2-0 lead-Scottish international midfielder Charlie Mulgrew's goal, a delightful freekick, the pick of the two. However, by the time Craig Conway converted a late penalty to make it 3-1 the game was up as Forest and Birmingham were winning. Forest's hero was Congolese striker Britt Assombalonga who set them on their way with a first-half

penalty-shortly after a superb save by their 'keeper Jordan Smith had kept the scores leveland added his second and the hosts' third with an excellent solo effort in the second-half.

That had Forest manager Mark Warburton, who took the job after an acrimonious departure from Scottish giants Rangers earlier this season, charging down the touchline fist pumping in celebration. Birmingham, whose wounds were largely self-inflicted with a disastrous run under Gianfranco Zola after the owners removed Gary Rowett despite being just outside the play-offs, scraped the win they needed at the very least. A first-half goal by Che Adams-in front of Bristol City's biggest crowd for 37 years of more than 25,000 - raised a smile from veteran caretaker manager Harry Redknapp and sighs of relief from the fans.— AFP

SYDNEY FC GRAB A-LEAGUE CROWN

SYDNEY: Player of the season Milos Ninkovic converted the winning penalty to crown Sydney FC the champions of Australia's A-League in a gripping shootout win over Melbourne Victory in the grand final yesterday. The Serbian midfielder fittingly put away the clinching penalty to win the shootout 4-2 after the two sides were locked at 1-1 following extra time. The victory completed a record-breaking season for Graham Arnold's Sky Blues, who won their third championship title.

"It's not the greatest way to win or lose," Arnold told reporters. "I wanted it so badly for the players, for all they have done this year." Melbourne Victory, who finished 17 points adrift of Sydney FC after the 27-round regular season, looked on track for an upset following a 20thminute strike by the A-League's all-time leading scorer Besart Berisha. The Kosovo striker turned defender Alex Wilkinson and then fired past goalkeeper Danny Vukovic to put Victory ahead.Sydney FC forced extra time when defender Rhyan Grant rammed home David Carney's partially saved volley with just over 20 minutes of normal time remaining.

An intense struggle was only decided when Vukovic kept out Marco Rojas's penalty attempt in the shootout with a diving right-hand save. Ninkovic, who won the John Warren Medal as the A-League's best player, then stepped up to put away the winning penalty and spark jubilant scenes among the sold-out 41,500 crowd at Sydney's Allianz Stadium. It was the first championship for Vukovic and Wilkinson after three previous losing grand finals. The Sky Blues have been hailed as the A-League's greatest team after finishing the regular season with a record 66 points from 20 wins and just one defeat in 27 games.

Yet due to the unique nature of Australian finals football, Sydney FC had to beat Melbourne Victory for a fourth time this season to lift their third A-League championship. Berisha scored for the fifth time in an A-League grand final and is the competition's all-time leading scorer with 102 goals. Melbourne Victory, coached by Kevin Muscat, were chasing their fourth championship. "It's gut-wrenching trying to find the words now to explain to the players how they have lost. They didn't deserve to lose," Muscat said.— AFP

FIFA GATHERS IN BAHRAIN UNDER A FRESH CLOUD

DOHA: Two years on from the corruption crisis which consumed FIFA, football's governing body meets for its latest annual Congress in Bahrain this week still far from free of suspicion. It was May 2015 in Switzerland, as delegates prepared for that year's Congress, when plain-clothes officers pounced and arrested scores of FIFA officials. The ramifications of that are still being feltwith ongoing investigations in the US and Switzerland-and 24 months later fresh problems are emerging for the still relatively new leadership of president Gianni Infantino.

The run-up to this year's event in Manama, on May 11, has been overshadowed by the resignation from the FIFA council of powerbroker Sheikh Ahmad al-Fahad al-Sabah, who is facing corruption allegations in the US. Kuwaiti Sheikh Ahmad has been named as a coconspirator of disgraced Guam football chief Richard Lai, who recently pleaded guilty to receiving nearly \$1 million in bribes from football officials wanting his help to influence FIFA. Sabah's prominence across sport cannot be underestimated, as he also heads the Association of National Olympic Committees, the Olympic Council of Asia and has other senior sport administration posts, including with the Asian Football Confederation (AFC).

Issues on FIFA's agenda this week could also prove contentious. Item 16 is a proposal to look at how FIFA allocates its most prestigious tournament, the World Cup. Under current rules, the event cannot be staged in the same region more than once every 12 years. However, any change to this policy could allow football's emerging power, China, to make a bid for the 2030 tournament, just eight years after its AFC colleague, Qatar, controversially hosts the 2022 World Cup.

Any such move is likely to be challenged by Argentina and Uruguay which wants to jointly host the tournament in 17 years' time to mark the centenary of the very first World Cup, played in Montevideo. Another contentious issue is that of Israel and Palestine. The Palestine Football Association argues that the presence of six Israeli clubs on its territory is in

breach of FIFA statutes, which forbids another member association playing on another territory without permission. Israel argues that FIFA rules are unenforceable as there is no permanent border.

AFC FINALLY VOTES

But even before the FIFA Congress convenes, there could be controversy in Manama.BRN On May 8, in the same venue, the AFC will hold its rescheduled congress to finally elect its FIFA Council members. This vote has been delayed since last September when the AFC took just 27 minutes to abandon their extraordinary congress in Goa. The meeting was abruptly cancelled after Saoud Al-Mohannadi, Qatar Football Association's vice-president, was stopped at the very last minute from standing for election for the FIFA council.

He was then banned from football for a year after being accused of not cooperating with a FIFA corruption enquiry. However, last month, in a rare reversal, Mohannadi won his appeal against the ban handed down by a FIFA ethics committee. This exoneration though was too late for him to apply to stand for the council again. Mohannadi though has said he will be in Bahrain and has been "examining" ways to run again for election. Another item for the AFC to decide is whether or not to agree to Iraq's request to end the international ban on hosting football matches.—AFP

A week after a 3-1 romp secured the bragging rights in the Rome derby, Lazio extended their impressive endof-season run of form to lead 5-1 by half-time. Simone Inzaghi's men made sure there was little chance of a comeback from the Genoa side with Senad Lulic hitting their sixth just after the hour before Immobile completed his double 20 minutes from time. Lazio's 21st win of the campaign left the capital side in fourth but Roma, and a possible Champions League qualifying place, remain in sight with three games left to play. MUNER TAKES BLAME FOR REDS STALEMATE



LIVERPOOL: Liverpool's James Milner missed a penalty as his side wasted a chance to bolster their bid to qualify for the Champions League in an uninspiring 0-0 draw with Southampton yesterday. With rivals Arsenal and Manchester United clashing in yesterday's late kick-off, Jurgen Klopp's team had a golden opportunity to seize the initiative in the race for a top-four finish. But

the Reds never got out of first gear at Anfield in a terrible contest best remembered for Fraser Forster's brilliant penalty save from Liverpool skipper Milner.

It was Milner's first missed penalty since November 2009, when he was playing for Aston Villa against Bolton, and it summed up the feeling that this would not be Liverpool's day. Liverpool moved above Manchester City into third place, but they will hope fifth-placed United fail to close the gap with a win at Arsenal. Philippe Coutinho started despite suffering a dead leg against Watford last week yet he had little impact during a match where nobody in a red shirt stood out.

Liverpool had failed to score against Southampton in their three previous encounters this season, once in the Premier League and in both legs of their League Cup semi-final tie, and the opening stages of this game contained very little attacking ambition from either side. In fact, this match furthered the idea that Liverpool struggle against Premier League sides of a lesser calibre, especially those teams that look to do little else but cling on for a point, as Southampton did for most of this match. In the opening 45 minutes, the home side had the lion's share of possession but they did very little with it as Southampton sat deep and were more than happy to contain the likes of Divock Origi, Emre Can and Roberto Firmino.

FRACTIOUS

Firmino had the first real effort of note after 15 minutes, firing a shot straight at Maya Yoshida and Anfield soon became as stale and as flat as the contest itself. The match became increasingly

fractious as Liverpool grew frustrated by their inability to break down the disciplined visitors. Immediately after the interval, Sofiane Boufal had the visitors' first effort, dribbling through a packed six-yard box but his tame effort was easily smothered at the last second by Liverpool's defense. The half-time break had done few favors for either side though as Liverpool remained dull and Southampton were more than happy to get nine men behind the ball and concentrate on defense at all costs. Firmino's trickery could not unlock Southampton's back-four while Origi and Coutinho remained virtually anonymous during an occasion when Liverpool really needed them at their best.

Finally though, Liverpool got the opportunity they needed to punish Southampton as Jack Stephens elbowed away the ball inside the area after challenging Origi.It was well spotted by referee Bobby Madley and although Milner's spotkick was right in the corner, Forster did well to get down and palm the effort away. The passionate way Southampton's players celebrated the fine save was also an indicator of how desperate they were to hold on for a point.

Klopp brought Daniel Sturridge and Adam Lallana on with 20 minutes to go in a bid to give Liverpool a spark. But the Liverpool boss became increasingly restless and angry on the sideline. Sturridge could have lifted the mood when 12 yards out but he poked an effort straight at Forster. Lallana then had his own 20-yard effort saved by Forster with five minutes left before the Southampton keeper made another stunning save in stoppage-time, tipping over a Marko Grujic header to help the visitors hang on. — AFP

SLICK ARSENAL END MAN United unbeaten run

ARSENAL REVIVE TOP FOUR BID



LONDON: Arsenal scored twice in three minutes through a deflected Granit Xhaka strike and Danny Welbeck's header to claim a deserved 2-0 win over Manchester United yesterday and inflict a first Premier League defeat on the visitors in 26 games. The victory at the Emirates Stadium keeps sixth-placed Arsenal's hopes of a top-four finish alive, but they are six points adrift of Manchester City, who currently occupy the final Champions League qualifying slot, albeit with a game in hand.

The win also takes Arsenal within two points of fifth-placed United, who stay four points behind City having played the same number of games as their local rivals. "Hopefully this result will give us confidence," said man-of-the-match Aaron Ramsey. "I said a couple of weeks ago we had to win every match and unfortunately we didn't do that against Tottenham (in a 2-0 loss last weekend). But we will see."

For all of United manager Jose Mourinho's pre-match bluster about fielding a weakened team, his only concession to youth in eight changes from his midweek Europa League team was 19-year-old defender Axel Tuanzebe, who made his Premier League debut. Everything else was familiar, with United under orders to produce the sort of bodies behind the ball performance that makes them so hard to beat. However frustrating the tactics, there is no doubting their effectiveness and the first half finished with Arsenal having spurned a series of chances and the Emirates again jittery.

Twice United defenders had denied Welbeck on the six-yard area while darting runs from the ever impressive Ramsey almost saw him get on the end of pinpoint balls from Aaron Sanchez. United also had their chances before the break, with Arsenal goalkeeper Petr Cech saving from Anthony Martial. But after a battling first-half display, the visitors were undone after the interval with Xhaka's 25metre shot looping up off Ander Herrera to catch out United keeper David De Gea after 54 minutes and then Welbeck adding a second against his former side with a header from Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain's cross.

There was no way back for United and, for once in a troubled season, the Arsenal fans could relax and forget the will he-won't he concerns about whether manager Arsene Wenger will renew his contract. The win could not have been better timed and was Wenger's first over Jose Mourinho in a league game. For United, the only realistic route to Champions League qualification now lies in winning the Europa League in which they host Spaniards Celta Vigo at Old Trafford in the semi-finals on Thursday holding a 1-0 win from the first leg. "Yes is all on the Europa league," said Mourinho, "but you cannot say we did not try to win."—Reuters

BENATIA IN A LIVE TV RACISM STORM

MILAN: Italian football has been hit by a second racist storm inside a week after Juventus defender Mehdi Benatia was insulted live on air during a live, postmatch television interview with Italian state broadcaster Rai. Benatia, a Morocco international, was being interviewed following a 1-1 Serie A draw at home with city rivals Torino when it was cut embarrassingly short by what seemed like a studio technician's gaffe. As he was speaking to studio presenters about Juventus, Benatia heard a voice over his radio earpiece say: "What are you saying, shitty Moroccan?" Benatia, who had been answering a question about Juventus winning their sixth consecutive Serie A title, stopped midsentence and said: "Who said that? What stupid person is speaking?"

Presenters also heard the remark, but tried to brush it off, telling Benatia: "It seems there are some technical problems. No one hear has been heard making any insults." A visibly angry Benatia wiped his brow as presenters thanked him for his time before bringing the interview to an abrupt end. It is thought the remark came from a careless studio technician who had left a microphone on, but it put racism firmly back in the spotlight a week after the controversy surrounding Ghana's Sulley Muntari.

Pescara midfielder Sulley Muntari says Saturday he felt "treated like a criminal" after being sanctioned for walking off the pitch during a 1-0 loss at Cagliari last week where he fell victim to racial abuse. Muntari was booked by the referee for complaining about the abuse and then shown a red card for walking off the pitch in the final minutes. After he personally appealed to league bosses, his ban was rescinded on Saturday when he said: "I was being treated like a criminal. How could I be punished when I was the victim of racism?"— AFP

INDIA'S PROPERTY LAW SEEKS TO PROTECT HOME BUYERS

GREATER NOIDA, India: In 2010, Neena Nagpal and her husband spent their life savings on a flat outside Delhi that was never built. Now, a new law seeks to protect thousands of home buyers like her from unscrupulous property developers. "The entire experience has been painful," says the 54-year-old, whose husband recently died, leaving her to take care of their partially deaf son alone in a tworoom house in a run-down part of the Indian capital. "When you don't walk what you talk, it really hurts us." From the mid-2000s onward, millions of middle class Indians eager to own their own homes poured cash into new building projects on the outskirts of major cities as a property boom took hold across the country.

Many were young workers in the burgeoning IT sector eager to break away from the traditional joint family set-up. But the industry was riddled with problems and buyers were almost always the victims. "What was shown and what was delivered was always different," said Gulam Zia, executive director at real estate consultancy Knight Frank India. "Developers got away with whatever they wanted and consumers always got a raw deal. Now a developer can't hide anything and he can't go back to his old habit of taking the consumer for a ride." Developers could face jail sentences of up to three years and substantial fines under the new law, which took effect on May 1 and applies to ongoing as well as new projects.

State governments will be responsible for keeping tabs on developers' progress and ensuring they stick to their plans for everything from the number and size of apartments to the construction schedule. Buyers' money will have to be deposited in an escrow-like account and can only be used for the property they are investing in-not to launch the developer's next project.

If the flats are not delivered on time, the developer will have to pay the monthly interest on the buyers' bank loans. The Confederation of Real Estate Developers' Associations of India, a trade body, welcomed the new law saying it had been calling for better regulation. "This will go a long way in restoring consumer faith in the real estate sector," said its president Jaxay Shah.

Thousands of cases

The road from Delhi to the satellite city of Noida provides ample evidence of the problems, lined as it is with half-built apartment buildings, most behind schedule. Among them is Lotus Panache, where Nagpal and her family were hoping to make a home. The 3C Company sold the development as "an enviable blend of sheer luxury and suburban lifestyle", touting ambitious plans for a creche and

135,000 square-foot (12,500 square-metre) sports and leisure centre. The reality-rows of unfinished shells-is a far cry from that. Although every buyer has paid at least 90 percent of the price, only about 800 of the 4,200 promised apartments have been delivered so far and the project is nearly four years behind schedule. The promised sports and leisure facilities amount to some workout equipment in one of the empty flats, a small swimming pool and some swings for kids on a brown patch of land. About 600 buyers have filed a case against the developer in a consumer court demanding the homes they paid for and fair compensation for the delay. But the slow pace of India's overburdened judicial system means they are still waiting. One couple borrowed two million rupees (\$44,000) to buy an apartment on the 19th floor of a development being built on the outskirts of Delhi by Supertech.—AFP

S KOREANS WANT NEW LEADER TO CREATE JOBS MINUS CORRUPTION

Months-long protests lead to arrest of Samsung chief

SEOUL, South Korea: Creating jobs, ending corruption and boosting stubbornly low birthrates should be high on a to-do list for South Korea's next president after a campaign mostly dominated by security and foreign policy issues. There's concern that the economy will likely take a backseat to North Korea when South Koreans pick their next leader tomorrow. Voters have been rattled by a row over who should foot the bill for a US anti-missile system deployed in the country to defend against North Korean aggression, after President Donald Trump suggested that South Korea should pay more for US security commitment.

Public demand for change in South Korea's

reform agenda to change the economic system," said Park Sang-in, a professor at Seoul National University's Graduate School of Public Administration. "Their talks on jobs and innovation were so superficial that they could not win public support."

On jobs, the two main contenders hold different views on what the government should do. Moon Jae-in, the front-runner from the main opposition Democratic Party, believes that a bigger government would be better for creating jobs and says South Korea needs more public workers. His main rival Ahn Cheol-soo also puts jobs high on his policy agenda but says the government should not be heavy-handed in inter-

economic system remains high as growth and wealth continue to be concentrated in the hands of top few family-run business giants known as chaebol. Anger over allegations of collusion between big businesses and the government helped trigger massive months-long protests that led to the ouster of President Park Geun-hye in March and the arrest of the de-facto leader at Samsung, South Korea's largest business group. Leading presidential contenders have tried to tap into the discontent over economic injustice, high youth unemployment and increased inequality between those with full-time jobs at chaebol and those who are underemployed or looking for work.

But the lack of concrete reform plans means that none of their economic agenda gained much attention during the campaign. "Candidates fell short of expectations from the public and could not thoroughly cover the

vening in the private sector and instead focus on making the markets fair and friendlier for innovation. "The origin of every crisis in South Korea is jobs," Moon said during an economic debate. "It is because economic growth has continued without creating jobs and markets have failed to create jobs for a long time."

Moon's campaign pledges include creating 810,000 jobs in the public sector, including bureaucrats, firefighters and social workers, at a cost of 4.2 trillion won (\$3.7 billion) per year. Moon said he will add an extra budget of 10 trillion won (\$8.8 billion) immediately once he takes office and a lion's share of that will be allocated for job creation. Ahn's campaign has argued that Moon's approach is no different from the previous governments that have relied on chaebol for economic growth, showering them with special treatment that resulted in cozy ties that in many cases led to corruption.

Instead, his team supports the idea of easing regulations to encourage companies to take risks while the government focuses on supporting small firms. "So far, South Korea's growth has been led by the government while giving special treatments to chaebol. That should change now," Ahn said. "When the private sector, especially when small- and medium-sized companies and venture firms grow, more quality jobs will be created."

The two leading candidates also differ in what would be the best way to help small companies and encourage the country's young talents who are drawn to high wages and job security at Samsung, Hyundai and other big businesses, to take more risks and work at small firms.

Moon has pledged that the government will pay the salary of one in every three workers at small companies for three years. Ahn has promised that the government will guarantee high wages to young workers at small firms by giving \$440 per month to an employee hired by a small company for two years. The new South Korean president, who will take office May 10, will face a narrowing window of opportunity to restore the vitality in Asia's fourth-largest economy.

There has been a growing sense of doom and lack of hope, especially among South Korea's young generations. Youth unemployment has surged last year to nearly 10 percent - the highest since 2000. Flagging birthrates have never surpassed 1.3 babies per woman for nearly two decades.

Government welfare spending is among the lowest in the world. Corporate culture is famous for being unfriendly to family or to raising children with one of the world's longest working hours. That has created a vicious cycle of growing number of people who postpone or even give up on starting a family.

Both Moon and Ahn recognize that the next administration should change all: the hereditary succession at the big businesses that distort market rules; the gaps between the full-time, stable jobs and contract jobs; the corporate culture and long working hours hostile to raising children. Whoever wins, South Korea will likely see attempts to limit the power of chaebol's founding families, whose influence is compared to emperors even though they hold a small stake in publicly listed companies founded by their fathers or grandfathers.

To pass down the companies to the next generation of the founding families, it was common for them to make an elaborate scheme involving giving lucrative businesses to their sons and daughters and creating a complicated web of cross-shareholding. On chaebol reforms, Moon and Ahn's pledges have been almost identical. They have promised to stop such unfair business leadership successions and to respond sternly to the white collar crimes committed by chaebol's founding families. The role of the trade regulator will be increased, they say. —AP

MOZAMBIQUE'S GAS BOOM DREAM UNDER THREAT

PALMA, Mozambique: The small, palmfringed fishing town of Palma was meant to become a symbol of Mozambique's glittering future, transformed by one of the world's largest liquefied natural gas projects. But construction has fallen far behind schedule and the town's fate is uncertain after gas prices fell and the government became engulfed in a \$2 billion debt scandal.

Tucked between the turquoise waters of the Indian Ocean and thick tropical forests, Palma remains a sleepy village of 3,000 people, still waiting for the promised arrival of new jobs and infrastructure. The discovery of gas reserves in 2010, estimated at 180 trillion cubic feet (five trillion cubic metres) in the surrounding Rovuma Basin, was the biggest natural gas find in recent decades.

Experts have predicted that Mozambique could become the world's third-largest exporter of liquefied natural gas (LNG) and an African version of wealthy Qatar. Plans to exploit the reserves moved fast, and Palma's residents were soon looking for opportunities to lift themselves out of poverty in one of the world's poorest nations. "It's only through such projects that we will get proper jobs because otherwise we just depend on the sea," said 46-year-old fisherman Pedro Abuda-Nchamo. Since the discovery of the gas, the face of the town has started to change. Excavators and construction vehicles are working on the planned liguefaction plant and export facilities. A gated residential complex for the anticipated influx

of skilled workers is almost ready, and the town's first shopping mall is being built.

But the much-touted gas project has run into strong headwinds. Initial estimates were that the first LNG would come on stream in 2016 but now it is expected in 2023 — or later. The plunge in global gas prices has led energy companies to slow down capital expenditure. Meanwhile the government in Maputo is caught up in a debt scandal that has triggered an economic crisis unseen since the end of the southern African country's civil war in 1992.

Vast secret debts

News emerged last year that the government had borrowed massively-including three secret loans amounting to \$2 billionbetween 2012 and 2014 to fund a coastal protection project. As a result, the International Monetary Fund and World Bank have suspended budgetary support. The loans, which the government is unable to repay, were taken out in anticipation of the gas windfall that remains elusive. "The government thought it would repay the loans with gas money," said Borges Nhamire, analyst with CIP, an anti-corruption non-governmental organization. Analysts fear that Mozambique's state-owned Empresa Nacional de Hidrocarbonetos (ENH), a minority partner in the gas project, may now struggle to raise its contribution of the share capital-although ENH insists it will

GREEK UNIONS PROTEST AGAINST SUNDAY TRADING

ATHENS: Hundreds of people gathered in central Athens to protest against plans to increase yesterday trading hours in a rally organized by unions and communist groups. Yesterday's demonstration largely drew members of the PAME communist labor union alongside others representing small- and medium-sized businesses (SMEs) who oppose reforms demanded by Greece's international creditors.

Demonstrators rallied in the city centre carrying flags and banners in Greek reading "Never work on Sunday," an AFP correspondent said. Shops in Greece are currently compelled to open on the first Sunday of every month in a step imposed three years ago by the country's creditors.

The reform would increase the number of Sundays from 12 times a year to 30. Union and the International Monetary Fund, which are among the measures that must be approved by the Greek parliament by mid-May. Unions have called a 24-hour general strike on May 17 to protest against the new measures, whose adoption is a prerequisite for unblocking a new sevenmillion-euro (\$7.7 million) tranche of loans that Athens needs to meet its debt repayment schedule in July.

Deregulation has been at the heart of the "reforms" demanded by Greece's creditors since the explosion of the country's debt crisis in 2010, with the aim of boosting growth. Following an unprecedented six-year recession, the Greek economy is still struggling to recover with growth flat in 2016. For 2017, the European Commission has revised down its growth

ADB HOPING US WILL STEP UP AND SUPPORT REGIONAL LENDER Trump prefers to bilateral cooperation

YOKOHAMA: The head of the Asian Development Bank said yesterday he is hoping the US will step up and support the regional lender despite President Donald Trump's avowed preference for bilateral cooperation.

ADB President Takehiko Nakao told reporters at a news conference wrapping up the bank's annual meeting that it "isn't really good" that the second largest shareholder in the development bank is lacking a permanent appointee to the US executive directorship.

Nakao said he hoped Washington would nominate an ambassador soon. Many such positions have yet to be filled, and the previous US ambassador to the ADB was ordered back to the US along with many other appointees of the previous administration.

For a country that is a co-founder of one of the world's most influential lending institutions, the US presence at the ADB annual meeting - one marking its 50th year of operations was low key. Japan is the largest donor to the ADB and plays a leading role in its management. It is unclear what Trump's "America First" foreign policy stance means for the ADB, or even for Asia in general.

Soon after taking office in January, Trump announced the US would withdraw from the Trans-Pacific Partnership regional trade agreement, saying he prefers country-to-country trade deals.

Trump recently appointed Eli H. Miller, chief of staff at the Treasury Department, as acting director of both the ADB and the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development pending a permanent appointment. Miller did not attend the ADB's annual meeting. The top US representative in Yokohama was Robert Kaproth, US deputy assistant secretary for Asia.

The ADB is preparing to set its long-term strategy for the years leading to 2030, and

Nakao said he intends to make the lender "stronger, better and faster." He said the regional bank, which has dozens of member countries from the Asia-Pacific region and beyond, has been a relatively efficient source of support for development of a region that once was characterized by extreme poverty.

"The US investment in Asia has been very efficient and productive. I hope the US government will look at these issues and continue to invest in the ADB," Nakao said. A top priority for the ADB and other regional institutions is to help countries weather natural disasters and other threats. Apart from investing in infrastructure such as power plants, bridges and hospitals, the ADB provided financial support for countries during the 1997 Asian financial crisis, and is seeking ways to leverage more private investment to help make up for shortfalls in funding.

One of the bank's key roles has been to help reduce risks for investments in developing countries, thanks to its strong links to local governments. — AP

OMAHA: Listening to Warren Buffett never gets old to the thousands of Berkshire Hathaway shareholders who filled an arena Saturday to listen to the billionaire investor at the company's annual meeting.

More than 30,000 people came to Omaha to hear Buffett and Berkshire Vice Chairman Charlie Munger talk. The 86-year-old CEO and his 93-year-old partner have been leading the conglomerate for more than five decades, but the crowd is always listening for new tidbits of wisdom. Buffett is known for his candor and plain speaking.

Berkshire's top two executives acknowledged Saturday that they missed out on investing in Google years ago, but they expressed pride in the company they built through acquisitions and said they believe it will thrive for decades to come. "In retrospect, I think we were smart enough to figure out Google early, and we didn't," Munger said.

Buffett and Munger avoided technology investments for most of their careers because they said it was too hard to figure out which companies will win. Berkshire does now own 133 million Apple shares, but it just sold off onethird of its 81 million IBM shares because Buffett misjudged that firm.

Buffett had harsh words for Wells Fargo's managers who failed to respond promptly to the sales practices scandal that cost the former CEO his job last year. The bank said last fall that its employees opened up 2 million bank accounts without customer approval to meet unrealistic sales goals.

"The main problem was they didn't act when they learned about it," Buffett said. Berkshire is Wells Fargo's biggest shareholder. Buffett said he still believes in the long-term prospects of the bank even though Wells Fargo mishandled the scandal.

Buffett said there's no change in Berkshire's plan to eventually replace him. He said one of

the most important qualities his successor will need is a talent for wisely investing Berkshire's cash.

"We need a money mind as CEO," said Buffett, who has no plans to retire. Berkshire plans to name one of its existing managers CEO after Buffett is gone, and the decentralized structure of the company allows Berkshire's subsidiaries to largely run themselves. "We have an extraordinary group of good managers," Buffett said. The executives who run Berkshire subsidiaries look forward to the meeting just as the shareholders do.

Brooks Running CEO Jim Weber said he's always careful about how much of Buffett's

time he takes up when he talks to him, so those conversations tend to focus just on Brooks' running-shoe business. The annual meeting offers one of the few times Weber gets to hear Buffett discuss other topics.

"I want to hear him talk about the economy and investing," Weber said. "I'm looking forward to hearing him as much as everybody else." Dozens of companies Berkshire owns set up booths in an adjoining 200,000-square-foot exhibit hall to sell their products and take questions about their businesses. The event offers Geico insurance quotes, See's Candy, Justin cowboy boots, RVs and homes manufactured by Clayton Homes. — AP

UK SUPER-RICH GOT RICHER DESPITE BREXIT: RICH LIST

LONDON: Britain's super-rich "kept calm and carried on making billions" despite worries about Brexit, according to The Sunday Times newspaper's Rich List for 2017, with more billionaires living in the country than ever before. In the past 12 months, the total

wealth of Britain's richest 1,000 individuals and families surged 14 percent to £658 billion (\$854 billion, 777 billion euros), the paper said. It said that there

are now more UK-based billionaires than ever before, at 134. Industrialist brothers Sri and Gopi Hinduja topped the list with a combined wealth of £16.2 billion, up £3.2 billion over the previous year. "While many of us worried about the outcome of the EU referendum, many of Britain's richest people just kept calm and carried on making billions," said the list compiler, Robert Watts. — AFP





ZCASH, THE VIRTUAL MONEY MAKING ITS MARK

has been a smash success since its launch seven months ago, drawing in new users with promises of unrivaled privacy protection.

But the new virtual money could face a tough battle integrating into the wider financial system. After debuting on currency trading platforms in October, Zcash took off, hitting an exchange rate of \$1,000 per unit, putting it in league with the much better established Bitcoin, the virtual currency pioneer created in 2009.

While its value has since come down to earth, Zcash is attracting the interest of Russian, Chinese, Venezuelan and, as of May 4, South African consumers. Brazilians now use Zcash to

NEW YORK: Zcash, the latest virtual currency, pay taxes and electricity bills and make purchases. To make its mark in the world of virtual currencies, Zcash boasts that it protects user privacy. But because of that guarantee it does not offer the transparency demanded by authorities who want to prevent these new tender from being used in money laundering, financing terrorism, evading taxes or fraud.

Untraceable transactions

Zcash was developed by researchers at Johns Hopkins University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in the United States and Tel Aviv University and the Technion-Israel Institute of Technology in Israel. Only five of the six people who developed the cryptography have been publicly identified. It is based on a technology dubbed zk-Snark, which allows untraceable transactions.

The resulting data are encrypted but users are free to identify themselves. Other cryptocurrencies such as Dash and Monero offer a level of privacy, but Zcash goes further, even obscuring the origin of a payment.

This is the opposite of Bitcoin, which uses blockchain technology that publicly records transaction details including the unique alphanumeric strings that identify buyers and sellers.

"You don't expose all of your communications or all of your transactions to random peo-

ple on the internet you barely know," said Zooko Wilcox, CEO of Zerocoin Electric Coin Company, which manages Zcash. Virtual currencies are produced, or "mined," by banks of computers solving complex algorythms, an operation that can be expensive. Wilcox told AFP he hoped the expanded privacy protection could overcome businesses' reluctance to adopt Zcash as a trustworthy alternative to traditional state-controlled currencies.

But Jonathan Levin, co-founder of Chainalysis, a start-up that helps banks and authorities trace the origins and destinations of virtual currency payments, doubts Zcash will find its place in the wider financial system. "It is hard for existing financial institutions to integrate these types of crypto currencies as information on the origin of funds is very hard to ascertain," he said.

Financial institutions began to take an interest in Bitcoin, and in particular in its blockchain technology, once the darknet marketplace known as Silk Road was closed in 2013.

Silk Road facilitated Bitcoin transactions but was also platform for the sale of illegal drugs. "Nobody has ever used Zcash for any kind of crime as far as anyone knows," Wilcox said, while conceding that "all technologies can be misused." — AFP





'EN MARCHE' FOR A THIRD INTEREST RATE HIKE

hile the political soap opera contin-ues in Washington with the House of Representatives passing the healthcare reform bill aimed at repealing and replacing the Affordable Care Act; the Senate approved a \$1.1 trillion spending bill that will fund the federal government through September and prevent a shutdown.

On the monetary policy front, the May FOMC meeting offered little clues this week as the Committee kept rates unchanged and was constructive on economic developments despite the recent softening in GDP growth and the drop in inflation. The committee did not give any signal on the next rate hike or changes in the Fed balance sheet policy.

On growth, the statement acknowledged, however dismissed the latest soft data noting that consumer spending remain solid, and that the Q1 slowdown was likely to be temporary. Sentiments were more upbeat on business investment. Neither the growth slowdown nor the decline in core inflation in March changed the Committee's expectations that growth will continue at a moderate pace, the labor market will strengthen somewhat further, and inflation will stabilize around 2% over the medium term.

On the data, the FOMC acknowledged that "the labor market has continued to strengthen even as growth in economic activity slowed. Job gains remain solid, on average, in recent months, and the unemployment rate declined. Household spending rose only modestly, but the fundamentals underpinning the continued growth of consumption remained solid". Inflation measured on a 12-month basis recently has been running close to the Committee's 2 percent.

Market probability of a hike stood at 90 percent for June in comparison to 67 percent prior to the FOMC meeting.

On the global economic front, the Eurozone growth may accelerate more and the ECB monetary policy guidance could change as the recovery picks up, ECB chief economist Peter Praet said, reinforcing expectations for a more upbeat economic assessment from the bank. Economic growth is broadening and there is potential for a positive surprise in the second quarter noting that inflation was also set to rise gradually to near the ECB's target by 2019.

On the foreign exchange side, the dollar index reached a 7-month low at 98.543 on Friday after an upbeat UK and Eurozone figures helped building pressure on the dollar.

The Euro continued to shun the French election risk and opened the week at 1.0905

and continued to surge reaching a six-month high of 1.1000 on Friday following the FOMC meeting and supported by the GDP figures coming on expectations. With the second round of the French Presidential Election on Sunday, the centrist candidate Emmanuel Macron is leading the polls and expected to easily win the election. The currency closed the week at 1.1000.

The pound sterling continued to be supported ignoring the risks emanating from the Brexit negotiations. Cable held its ground above 1.2900 and is expected to trade with high volatility should the political fight with the EU persist. The sterling closed the week at 1.2984.

The Japanese yen reached a six-week high at 113.04 against the dollar but softened back to close at the 112.72 level on Friday.

Non-manufacturing index on the other hand rose to 57.5, the second-highest since October 2015 from 55.2 in March. The results are in line with projections for a rebound in economic growth this quarter coming off the weakest pace in three years.

The surge in non-factory orders also extended to customers beyond US borders export demand climbed to the highest level in nearly a decade. On the employment front, US non-farm payroll recovered in April after the disappointing March figures. April non-farm data came at 211K versus an expected 194K setting the stage for a potential interest rate hike in June. According to the report, job gains occurred in most sectors ranging from leisure and hospitality to finance and mining sectors. Furthermore, unemployment claims for the

There were also more encouraging signs from the house building sector, as growth recovered to its strongest so far this year. investors at a time of weak income growth cannot be strengthening the resilience of our economy. Nor can a high concentration of interest-only loans." In such a case, "an otherwise manageable downturn could be turned into something more serious".

Another negative surprise came on the back of the disappointing trade surplus falling more than expected in March to AUD 3.1 billion, despite upward revisions across the prior four months, with February now the second highest on record at AUD 3.7 billion. The trade data implies a large net export drag in the first quarter pressuring down economists' GDP forecast.

Finally, the RBA latest Statement showed a small upgrade to GDP, with growth by June 2018 now forecast between 2.75 and 3.75 percent. The Bank said that it had greater confidence that inflation would pick up, but that's in the context of an inflation forecast that doesn't return to the Bank's target range until June 2019. The cash rate is likely to be stuck at 1.5 percent for longer than the market has priced.

China property sales

According to data from the Chinese real estate services, property sales volumes in China's top 50 cities declined by 19 percent on a yearly basis and 10 percent on a monthly basis. This reflects the adverse impact of the recent round of tightening measures that have been rolled out since mid-March. The government has been trying to curb property prices in China this year.

Bank of Japan Governor Kuroda said that "the mindset is still quite cautious about inflation expectations, but I'm quite sure that with continuous accommodative monetary policy, supported by fiscal policy, we'd be able to eventually raise wages and prices significantly".

The projected growth rate of 1.5 percent is "not great" but it is well above the mediumterm potential growth rate which means that the output gap will shrink and become positive while the labor market continues to tighten. In that event, wages and prices would eventually rise to achieve the 2 percent inflation target around the fiscal year 2018. He acknowledges that "headline inflation has been quite slow to adjust upward" in part because of weakness in oil prices.

Mixed US Data

US manufacturing missed expectations in April as employers reported less hiring and a slower pace of incoming orders, according to the ISM report. Indeed the purchasing manager's index slipped to 54.8 from 57.2. Economists had forecasted a reading of 56.5, with the biggest decrease was recorded in previous week came at 238K against an expected 246K. Finally the unemployment rate came at 4.4 percent as a result of the performance of both public and private sector.

Eurozone economic growth

Euro area economic growth accelerated to a six year high at the start of the second quarter. This was signaled by the final Eurozone PMI Composite Output Index rising to 56.8 in April, up from 56.4 in March and the earlier flash estimate of 56.7. Activity has expanded for 46 months in a row. Output growth accelerated at manufacturers and service providers, with rates of increase hitting 72-month records in both cases. The slightly sharper expansion was again registered in manufacturing. Underpinning in March to 57.3 in April on the back of strong demand at home and abroad, according to a survey that will temper worries about a Brexit-driven economic slowdown this year. The manufacturing sector, which makes up about a tenth of the UK economy, enjoyed the strongest pick-up in new work since the start of 2014 and smashed expectations in April. Firms also took on new workers at a faster pace and ramped up production.

RBA concerned about household debt

Reserve Bank of Australia Governor Lowe said that "the recent increase in household debt relative to our incomes has made the economy less resilient to future shocks. Double-digit growth in debt owed by

improved a lot. German unemployment keeps falling much faster than its European partners. Falling



unemployment and job creation is crucial to faster European economic recovery. Most of this economic recovery is due to policy-driven measures by the European central bank and the weakness of the Euro against the US dollar. How long these supporting factors remain is open to question. Most likely in the coming year, the European Union

governments and central banks needed to draw up an exit strategy from fiscal and monetary stimulus measures, to ensure they were withdrawn at the right time and in a way, that does not do economic damage.

The economic recovery has made some investors a little over enthusiastic for the future prospect. I think it is a bit early to be carried away but the signs are there to cheer up. In some parts of the European Union such as Germany, Italy and France, sentiment among business executives, consumers and investors has increased since the start of the year with some expecting a much stronger economic recovery throughout the coming couple of years. The European Central bank does not share this positive sentiment. As usual Mario Draghi, the European Central Bank' president is being cautious. He is warning that risks remain to the downside and some economists maintain that the positive confidence might be at risk for a small correction. Nothing major to worry about.

The European Union's overall economy grew by 0.5 percent in the first quarter of 2017. This is much better than previous quarters and it seems that the growth is wide spread and is underpinned by solid exports and consumers spending. The good news is that the positive confidence build up has not been shaken by political uncertainty in France or the UK added to that, the recovery suggests that investors' mood isn't being shaken by political doubt related to the French elections and Brexit.

European Union's industrial manufacturing and services companies have been experiencing the strongest activity in six years. At the same time business executives and consumers feel most positive on the economy in almost 10 years. For the time being the economic recovery seems real at least in the short term but over the coming few years, factors affecting this recovery could change. This is a great investment opportunity that could last for at least till the end of this year. It seems that global investors are happy to bet on European equities if they believe the economic recovery is for real.

Investors should know that there are always some small hiccups once economic recovery takes hold. But equity investors should try to take advantage of any small corrections that might be caused by political upsets. The good news for equity investors is that the European economic growth forecast is nearly double of it achieved last year. This for sure will underpin stock valuations and increases the prevailing positive sentiment. The only spoiler is the unforeseen action of the European Central Bank. There is this expectation that the European Central bank will start working out an exit from unprecedented asset purchases and negative interest rates next month. Officials at the bank must be very careful that they do not make wrong policies just as the economic recovery picking up. They should acknowledge the improvement the economy has made and stress the risks it faces. - @Rasameel

storey brick building near a Moscow park where they love to cycle. Now they face the possibility that authorities will demolish their 1950s-era building and rehouse them in a tower block, in an urban development plan not seen since Soviet times to demolish more than 4,500 apartment blocks and relocate hundreds of thousands of Muscovites. "This is a brick building, everyone knows they can stand for up to 150 years, so this is a shock," said 31-year-old Yevseyeva, who works for a medical device company.

Backed by President Vladimir Putin, Moscow Mayor Sergei Sobyanin wants to knock down low-rise housing, focusing on the five-storey buildings thrown up under Soviet leader Nikita Khrushchev in the 1950s and 1960s as the USSR rushed to build housing for everyone.

Supporters argue the vast 3.5-trillion ruble (\$62.1-billion, 57-billion euro) project is vital, replacing the smaller, aged buildings with high-rise housing in Russia's fast-developing capital of 12 million which faces a housing crunch and rising rents.

But the program-due to start in September-has prompted protests from residents fearful of losing their homes and who say it rides roughshod over their property rights. And the level of outcry has even forced Putin to react in a bid to reassure residents. "The aim is to improve housing conditions for people who live in buildings that are falling down," the Kremlin strongman told ministers.

"It goes without saying that this should be done in such a way and with such means and methods so as to not breach the rights of citizens."

'Deportation of Muscovites'

Authorities initially wanted to demolish 8,000 buildings, home to 1.6 million people, but reduced the scale this month after conducting opinion polls. The first five-storey buildings-nicknamed khrushchevki after the Soviet leader-rehoused people living in communal flats-where entire families were squeezed into one room-and were celebrated as a symbol of social progress in films and Dmitry Shostakovich's 1958 operetta, "Moscow, Cheryomushki".

Now, some seven decades later, those backing the project to pull them down are billing it as an equally important transformation "It's a historic step. There probably hasn't been such large-scale change to Moscow since the 1950s," said ruling United Russia party MP Pyotr Tolstoy.

Often situated in leafy communal settings, the apartment blocks were built without lifts and kitchens are small. The worst are made of pre-cast concrete panels but many are brick.

"They're outdated. It's impossible to repair, renovate or reconstruct them people really do live in awful conditions," said the lawmaker. Tolstoy co-authored the bill on the demolitions that got the preliminary backing

of parliament, but many details are vague and remain left to be worked out.

Under the program people are promised a flat of "equivalent" size-not the same valuein the same, albeit likely spread-out, district. It would be impossible to legally contest eviction-only the new flat's size-and residents have just 60 days to move out.

'Nightmare'

Some people are happy to swap their pokey flats for new ones. "The building's worn-out: there's not much pleasant about it," said one resident, who gave only her first name Yekaterina, adding her kitchen measures just five square metres (54 square feet). But many are deeply upset and have not been afraid to express their anger.

Yevseyeva, who lives in a spacious 1957 building with high ceilings and thick walls, was horrified to realise her home could be at risk if demolition plans for her building go ahead. "We were sure it didn't face any threat, but according to this bill, it's possible to take away any property," she said, calling the plan "a nightmare".

She has joined a Facebook protest group with 16,000 members and held a placard against "deportation of Muscovites" at a rallythe first she ever attended. In theory, a majority of residents in each building will need to approve demolition and only unsafe buildings will be touched, but with property

developers standing to profit from taking over prime real estate, many people say they are worried they will be forced out.

"We risk handing Moscow over to business and city contractors," warned lawmaker Mikhail Degtyarev, of the nationalist Liberal Democrat Party, in parliament. At a packed public meeting in Izmailovo, a district by a

large park, officials didn't help their cause by failing to specify where the new flats would be, leading to tempers fraying.

Sergei Mitrokhin, a leading member of the liberal opposition Yabloko party, warned inhabitants: "They're asking if you want to be moved or not-but they're not telling you where they're moving you to." — AFP

WASHINGTON: Sen Dianne Feinstein, the top Democrat on the Senate committee that oversees the FBI, said publicly this week that the government paid \$900,000 to break into the locked iPhone of a gunman in the San Bernardino, California, shootings, even though the FBI considers the figure to be classified information.

The FBI also has protected the identity of the vendor it paid to do the work. Both pieces of information are the subject of a federal lawsuit by The Associated Press and other news organizations that have sued to force the FBI to reveal them. California's Feinstein cited the amount while questioning FBI Director James Comey at a Senate Judiciary Committee oversight hearing Wednesday.

"I was so struck when San Bernardino happened and you made overtures to allow that device to be opened, and then the FBI had to spend \$900,000 to hack it open," Feinstein said. "And as I subsequently learned of some of the reason for it, there were good reasons to get into that device." Comey hinted at a ballpark range last year, saying the government paid more than he would earn in his remaining seven years on the job, an amount that would have been at least \$1.3 million.

The federal government paid the sum as it cut short an extraordinary court fight with Apple Inc., which was resisting a judge's order to help the Justice Department hack into the phone of Syed Rizwan Farook, who along with his wife killed 14 people in a San Bernardino attack in December 2015. An unidentified third party came forward last March with a solution to open the phone.

The AP and other news organizations last year filed a public records lawsuit to learn how much the FBI paid. The Justice Department has said in court filings that the information was properly classified. It argued that the information it withheld, if released, could be seized upon by "hostile entities" that could develop their own countermeasures and interfere with the FBI's intelligence gathering. Feinstein's spokesman, Tom Mentzer, would neither discuss the senator's remarks nor say whether she was offering an estimate or disclosing information obtained in an FBI briefing. The FBI had no immediate comment Friday. —AP

NEW YORK: Burger King pulled a pretty juicy marketing stunt last month that drew plenty of attention - not just to the Whopper, but also to the intrinsic vulnerabilities of a new type of voice-activated gadget. The fast food chain's 15-second television ad targeted Google Home, a speaker that can answer questions and control other smart appliances. When an actor in the ad said "OK, Google" and asked a question about the Whopper, Google Home obediently began reading the burger's ingredients in homes around the country - effectively extending the commercial for however long it took someone to shout "OK, Google, stop!"

Google and Wikipedia quickly made fixes to shut it down. Though annoying, the stunt may have done some good by highlighting how easy it is to hijack such devices. (Just imagine a burglar spying a voice assistant and asking it to unlock all the doors.) It could also speed the development of home voice assistants with better security. "It's a wakeup call," said Earl Perkins, a digital security analyst at the research firm Gartner. "It's a harbinger of things to come."

Trigger warning

Voice assistants such as Google Home, Apple's Siri and Amazon's Echo devices have always been susceptible to accidental hijack. A Google ad during the Super Bowl that used the phrase "OK, Google" reportedly set off people's devices. And in a January story that briefly turned a family into media celebrities, a woman's 6-year old daughter ordered a dollhouse and sugar cookies simply by asking Amazon's voice assistant Alexa for them.

Since the devices are so new - the Amazon Echo debuted in 2015, Google Home last year they're still having growing pains. And they're

cials and those of its partners can't inadvertently trigger the speaker. Developers that provide Echo with "skills" that let it, for instance, order pizza, are also prohibited from creating Alexa commands that would trigger ads. Google says it also has techniques to block TV ads from activating Google Home. Neither company provided details on those techniques. Voice assistants are still in their "very early days," Google says; the company

growing in popularity; Consumer Intelligence Research Partners estimates that Amazon sold 3 million Echo devices in the US in the fourth quarter of 2016, bringing the total to more than 8 million. Amazon doesn't release sales figures. Many experts believe that deliberate attempts to trigger voice assistants will be short-lived.

Among other things, brands have to face the consequences of potentially annoying millions of people. "Burger King was doing what the Burger King brand is known to do, stir controversy and make sure it gets lots of coverage," Forrester principal analyst James McQuivey said. "Very few brands want to do that." Of course, spammers and other bottom-feeding marketers can still try to implement the technique. But voice assistants already have a few ways to block them.

Threats and countermeasures

Amazon already makes sure its TV commer-

plans to "monitor and learn as we go."

Hackers might also be a threat. But because voice assistants are so new and limited in scope, more established connected devices such as webcams, routers and printers pose more of a threat for now. "It's not that we won't see some creative or unique instance (of hacking), but I don't think this is going to be the next great wave of cybercrime," said Steve Grobman, chief technology officer at the security company McAfee.

More security to come

But before long, the devices are going to need better security. "When you move into a world of voice, some of the rules that we're accustomed to, related to security for computers, change," Gartner's Perkins said. Exactly how that works could depend on exactly what task a voice assistant is performing. Asking about the weather requires less security than say, shopping or could help the device personalize recommendations or even ads for the individual, not the whole family. Apple already lets users voice-train its Siri digital assistant so it's more likely to activate only when it hears a specific voice. Amazon has a voice training option for Alexa. Google Home can recognize up to six different voices, though it won't prevent unauthorized users from activating the assistant.

Experts suggest that companies will eventually add cameras to voice assistants. Amazon's new Echo Look has a camera, but it's for offering fashion advice. Combining a facial scan with voice recognition would definitely beef up security, although they'll also create new privacy concerns. "Without any security or minimal security, (voice assistants are) going to be a fat target," Perkins said. "There will be all kinds of innovation associated with compromising these systems."—AP

NEW CURE FOR GULF'S THALASSEMIA SUFFERERS

DUBAI: Most of the Gulf's thalassemia sufferers can now be cured of the debilitating blood disease through a safe and effective bone marrow transplant procedure performed in the United States, said one of the world's leading pediatric hematologists, ahead of International Thalassemia Day on 8 May (today). Thalassemia is a genetic blood disease, common across the wider Middle East and South Asia, in which victims are not able to make enough hemoglobin - a necessary component in healthy red blood cells, carrying oxygen to all parts of the body - and, thus, suffer from severe anemia and eventual organ failure, and, ultimately, premature death.

The condition is typically treated with life-long, cost-prohibitive "supportive care", with most thalassemia sufferers dying before the age of 40. However, the latest advances in bone marrow transplantation significantly reduce both treatment time and cost, giving Gulf thalassemia patients and their families new hope. "With thalassemia, we want to treat the underlying disease, not just the symptoms, and this approach requires bone marrow transplantation," said Dr Rabi Hanna, pediatric oncologist at US-based Cleveland Clinic. "Now, finding a matching bone marrow donor is much easier, as we only require a haplo-donor 'half-match', meaning every patient can find a donor (father, mother or half-sibling), as opposed to only 25%, which has been the case for the last 25 years," added Dr Hanna.

Bone marrow transplantation is the process by which a compatible donor, typically a matching sibling, has his or her stem cells transplanted into the thalassemia patient's bloodstream via a tube called a central venous catheter. The stem cells travel through the blood into the bone marrow, thus enabling the growth of healthy, oxygen-carrying red blood cells. The leading US hospital also believes it can work far more effectively with Gulfbased physicians to reduce the standard one-year treatment timeline for transplantation patients, as well as the associated costs and familial inconveniences associated with patient relocation. Some patients may only need to spend as few as three months in the United States.

The Dubai Thalassemia Center at the Dubai Health Authority will be one of several healthcare providers in the region to consider the new curative treatment option for its patients. One such patient is 14-year-old Hussain Ahmed Almas, a UAE national who was seen and treated by Dr. Hanna at Cleveland Clinic last year and has benefited from a successful novel reduced intensity "Haplo" bone marrow transplant in November of 2016. "My life is now completely normal, and I expect to live into old age. I even have high energy levels, enabling me to experience activity for the first time in my life," said Almas. "I no longer require regular blood transfusions, and I can attend school without missing classes and other activities."

Thalassemia, an inherited blood disorder, is a highly prevalent disease in the UAE but can easily be prevented with a simple and inexpensive blood test. Thalassemia carriers are healthy people and can have healthy children, but they should not marry other carriers or they risk producing children born with disease. The Thalassemia International Federation (TIF) has designated 8 May each year as International Thalassemia Day, and UAE sufferers of the disease have come together to remember those victims lost to the disease but also celebrate those who fight the disease each day of their lives. The 8 May date serves as an annual reminder of the medical advancements made in the fight to cure the deadly disease.

made in Bonn next week "that would prejudice our future policy," undermine competitiveness for American businesses or restrict US economic growth. The US delegation will be led by Trigg Talley, the US deputy special envoy for climate change. The Trump administration has left the special envoy role vacant after the official who held the position in the Obama administration departed. Under the Paris deal, the US committed to cut its emissions 26 percent to 28 percent by 2025, compared to 2005 levels. Since Trump took office, the US has started deconstructing the set of regulations and climate policies that Obama put in place to help achieve the US target. But former Obama administration officials argue that because the targets are non-binding and can be updated, the Trump administration could remain in the Paris deal even if it acknowledges it will not achieve the 2025 target that Obama set. Though the agreement envisioned updated targets being more ambitious - not less - there's nothing prohibiting a country from downgrading its targets, the Obama officials have said. Even if Trump announces his intention to withdraw, the lengthy divorce process and other stipulations in the deal mean that the US would remain in the pact at least until November 2020 - around the same date as the next US presidential election. — AP

STRAWBERRY SCIENTIST IS SUED OVER 'FRUITS OF HIS RESEARCH'

FRESNO: Plant scientist Douglas Shaw spent his career toiling in the fields in California to grow the perfect strawberry, one that was plump and bright red yet remained sweet even after the long trip to grocery stores across the country. When the professor retired from the University of California at Davis and set up his own strawberry-breeding business, though, he found himself in a legal jam.

In a case set for trial in federal court later this month, the university is suing Shaw and his scientific partner, saying they stole the school's intellectual property by taking some of the fruits of their research with them. The two scientists claim in a \$45 million lawsuit of their own that the university has unfairly kept some of their work locked in a freezer and is depriving the world of a better strawberry. Some farmers in the No 1 strawberry-growing state are worried the battle is going to stymie research and cause them to lose their competitive edge.

California last year produced 1.6 million tons of strawberries valued at roughly \$2 billion, according to the US Department of Agriculture. "It doesn't do anybody any good for the university to keep these strawberry plants in a box," said Rick McKnight, an attorney for the two former professors. "This is hurting the California strawberry industry in a major way." Shaw, 63, is a giant in the strawberry world, heading the university's lucrative breeding program for more than two decades alongside fellow plant biologist Kirk Larson. Most of California's strawberry farmers grow plants developed by Shaw and Larson.

The two men developed 24 new varieties, allowing growers to double the amount of strawberries produced while retaining the fruit's succulence. They created strawberries that were more pest- and disease-resistant, more durable during long-distance travel, or capable of growing during the shorter days of spring and fall. The partners say their work netted the university \$100 million in royalties. How much they themselves made at UC Davis is unclear, but they say they contributed more than \$9 million of their own royalties toward the university's breeding program.

They retired from the university in 2014 because, they say, the school was winding down the program. Working in partnership with growers and nurseries, they launched a business called California Berry Cultivars, based in Watsonville, to develop new strawberry varieties. The university accuses the researchers of patent infringement and violating an oath they signed not to enrich themselves by taking or acquiring plants, seeds and other biological material and continuing their research using descendants of plants they developed at UC Davis. The scientists say they own the intellectual property at issue, and they accuse the university of locking up some of their plants and destroying hundreds of others, wiping out years of research. —AP

President Barack Obama and world leaders in 2015, nations agreed to non-binding pledges to cap or reduce emissions of heat-trapping greenhouse gases. The pact helped solidify a global consensus about addressing climate change that environmental groups worry may be undermined if the world's largest economy withdraws. "If the US pulls out, it will be a pariah," said Andrew Light, a climate adviser at the World Resources Institute.

"It will be on the sidelines, and that's going to hurt American businesses." Trump, as a candidate, threatened to "cancel" the deal, but since taking office has said he's studying it and plans a final decision soon. US officials say the timeline is being driven by the Group of 7 summit, which Trump will attend late this month in Italy. Trump needs to announce a decision before that summit so that leaders can determine whether and how to address climate change issues during the G-7.

SHHH. HEAR THE RUSTLE OF GRASS? NOT SO MUCH NOW IN US PARKS

Peaceful natural sounds, bird songs, rushing rivers and rustling grass, are being drowned out by human-made noise in nearly twothirds of America's protected parks, forests and wilderness areas, a new study finds. — AP **WASHINGTON:** The call of the wild is getting harder to hear. Peaceful, natural sounds- bird songs, rushing rivers and rustling grass - are sometimes being drowned out by noise from people in many of America's protected parks and wilderness areas, a new study finds. Scientists measured sound levels at 492 places - from city parks to remote federal wilderness. They calculated that in nearly two-thirds of the Lower 48's parks, the noise can at times be twice the natural background level because of airplanes, cars, logging, mining and oil and gas drilling.

That increase can harm wildlife, making it harder for them to find food or mates, and make it harder for people to hear those natural sounds, the researchers said. Colorado State University biologist George Wittemyer said people hear only half the sounds that they would in natural silence. "They're being drowned out," said Wittemyer, a co-author of the research. In about 1 in five public lands, there's a tenfold increase in noise pollution, according to the study in Thursday's journal Science.

"It's something that's sort of happening slowly," Wittemyer said. Except for city parks, though, the researchers are not talking about sound levels that people would consider unusually loud. Even the tenfold increases they write about are often the equivalent of changing from the quiet of a rural area to a still pretty silent library. But that difference masks a lot of sounds that are crucial, especially to birds seeking mates and animals trying to hunt or avoid being hunted, Wittemyer said. And it does make a difference for peace of mind for people, he said. "Being able to hear the birds, the waterfalls, the animals running through the grasslands ... the wind going through the grass," Wittemyer said. "Those are really valuable and important sounds for humans to hear and help in their rejuvenation and their self-reflection." For study lead author Rachel Buxton, a Colorado State conservation biology researcher, it can be personal. She points to a Thanksgiving weekend hike last year with her husband in the La Garita Wilderness in southern Colorado.

"We went to escape the crowds. We went to be totally isolated and have a real wilderness experience," Buxton recalled. "As we're hiking, aircraft goes overhead. You're walking along and you can hear the jet coming for ages." The research team, which includes a special unit of the National Park Service, not only measured sounds across the US, but they also used elaborate computer programs and artificial learning systems to determine what sounds were natural and which were made by people.

"The study makes perfect sense to me," George Mason University biology professor David Luther, who wasn't part of the research. He said in an email that he's noticed more noise at many sites throughout the US. "Olympic National Park is currently suffering high amounts of noise pollution from military flight trainings low over the park and visitors have been complaining loudly about the diminished wilderness experience," he wrote. But there are still some places where you can get away from it all, Buxton said, highlighting Great Sand Dunes National Park in Colorado. — AP

85-YEAR-OLD EVEREST RECORD SEEKER DIES

KATHMANDU: An 85-year-old ex-Gurkha who was attempting to reclaim his title as the world's oldest person to summit Mount Everest died of altitude sickness, the expedition organizer said yesterday. Min Bahadur Sherchan died at Everest base camp on Saturday and his body was airlifted to Kathmandu. "Doctors said that he died of natural causes. There was water build-up in his lungs because of altitude sickness," Shiv Raj Thapa of Summit Nepal Trekking said after an autopsy. Sherchan was resting at the base camp and waiting for the weather window to summit in a single attempt, skipping the usual multiple acclimatization rotations because of his age. He was on a bid to reclaim a title that he lost to Japanese mountaineer Yuichiro Miura in 2013.

The former soldier became the oldest person to summit Everest in 2008 when he was 76, but he lost the record five years later when Miura reached the 8,848-metre peak at the age of 80. Speaking to AFP earlier this year, the slightly hard of hearing grandfather said he just wanted to prove to himself that he could still make it to the top of the world. "My aim is not to break anybody's record, this is not a personal competition between individuals. I wish to break my own record," Sherchan had said in February. Sherchan's death is the second fatality of the spring climbing season on Everest, which runs from late April to the end of May. Experienced Swiss climber Ueli Steck died last month when he fell from a steep ridge during an acclimatization exercise.

Nearly 750 people will this year attempt to summit the world's highest mountain during the narrow window of good weather that usually falls in mid-May. Hundreds of climbers have been on Everest for weeks to acclimatize before making a bid for the top. This year is particularly crowded as it is the last chance for climbers who were forced off the mountain by the devastating 2015 earthquake to use their extended permits. This has raised concerns about dangerous traffic jams on the mountain. Mountaineering is a major revenue earner for impoverished Nepal, home to eight of the world's 14 peaks over 8,000 meters. — AFP

FLORIDA'S BUILDING BOOM THREATENS WILDLIFE-RICH LAGOON

FLORIDA: The most biologically diverse waterway in America is seriously ill. The Indian River Lagoon is repeatedly being choked with oxygen-robbing algae, its surface increasingly dotted with thousands of dead fish, manatees, birds and other creatures. The culprits: farm runoff and a huge influx of people that has sent lawn fertilizer and other pollutants into the lagoon, which runs 156 miles along Florida's Atlantic Coast, almost to Palm Beach, and includes the Cape Canaveral area.

"It's the death by a thousand cuts," said Bob Knight, an environmental scientist with the Howard T Odum Florida Springs Institute who has studied Florida's waters for 40 years. The lagoon's woes threaten the region's \$2.5 billion recreation, fishing and tourism economy, alarming kayak tour operators, charter boat captains, restaurateurs and organizers of bird-watching festivals. Environmentalists are distressed to see the lagoon's rich variety of life threatened in a crisis similar to what has happened in recent decades in such places as the Chesapeake Bay, Lake Erie and the Gulf of Mexico.

Heal the lagoon

Although the federal and state governments have spent hundreds of millions of dollars to heal the lagoon in recent years, an Associated Press examination found that pollution spiked, algae blooms spread and fish kills worsened over the past decade and a half as central Florida's population swelled faster than that of anywhere else in the state. Water quality data analyzed by the AP showed that the average level of phosphorous - a byproduct of fertilizers and human waste that algae thrive on rose nearly 75 percent between 2000 and 2016. Average chlorophyll readings, used to measure the presence of algae, almost tripled.

Home to more than 2,900 species of plants, birds and fish, the waterway has been polluted since the mid-20th century by fertilizer runoff from farms around Lake Okeechobee, which drains into the lagoon during heavy rains. Nevertheless, parts

remained largely healthy until the recent building boom. Since 2000, more than 1.5 million people moved into the six counties along the lagoon and three Orlando-area counties that drain into Lake Okeechobee or directly into the lagoon. More than 500,000 new homes were built in those counties over the same time period.

'Super bloom'

Paved-over expanses such as roads, driveways and parking lots have allowed runoff to make its way into the lagoon more easily. It has also been fouled by wastewater treatment plants that discharge into the lagoon, sewage spills from the plants during heavy rains, and leaky septic tanks. In 2011, an algae "super bloom" killed more than 1 million fish and other animals there, according to state data. Intense algal blooms have returned each year since then. Last year, toxic algae killed more than 100,000 creatures, including manatees, or sea cows.

Now the increased algae are inflicting new types of damage, researchers say. Last year, baby oysters died en masse for the first time because of the brown tide. That is doubly alarming, because oysters filter the water. Last year "was the icing on the cake because the fish kill didn't happen in remote parts of the river where people don't see it," said Laurilee Thompson, whose family owns the 465-seat Dixie Crossroads, a seafood restaurant on the Space Coast, as the Cape Canaveral area is known. "So now you have a very upset, influential populace that's going, 'Do something. Do something." The reported number of marine creatures that have died spiked to 1.2 million in 2011, compared with 7,000 in 2000, and experts blame the algae. "In 2011, the world seemed to shift and we suddenly got chlorophyll levels we'd never seen before," said Charles Jacoby, a water scientist with the St. Johns River Water Management District, a state water agency. "The system has been overloaded." - AP

NUCLEAR WASTE DEBATE - TURN IT INTO GLASS OR ENCASE IN CEMENT?

SPOKANE: Congress should consider authorizing the US Department of Energy to study encasing much of the nuclear waste at the nation's largest waste repository in a cement-like mixture instead of turning it into glass logs, according to a new report from the US Government Accountability Office. Doing so before burying the waste would be less expensive than a process called vitrification to turn the waste into the glass logs, said the report.

The process called grouting might also allow waste at the Hanford Nuclear Reservation in a remote part of southcentral Washington state to be treated more quickly, the report said. The waste is left over from plutonium production for nuclear weapons, including the bomb dropped on Nagasaki, Japan that led to the end of World War II. The Energy Department replied that it agreed with the work. "We can't afford to get distracted from the job at hand," Cantwell said. Hanford has about 56 million gallons (211 million liters) of waste stored in underground tanks until it can be treated for permanent disposal. Some tanks date back to World War II and are leaking. Another 42 million gallons (159 million liters) of similar waste from nuclear weapons production is stored at the government's Savannah River Site in western South Carolina near Georgia.

The process to encase waste there in the cement-like mixture called grout has been used for small amounts of the waste. Ground was broken at Hanford in 2002 for a \$17 billion vitrification plant - one of the federal government's most expensive construction projects - to separate much of the waste into high-level and low-level radioactive material. But the plant's construction has been halted by design and safety concerns. After the highly radioactive waste is immobilized in the glass logs, it would be shipped to a national repository proposed for Yucca Mountain in Nevada which has not been built. The proposal to study cement-like encasement would only apply to waste with lower levels of radioactivity representing about 90 percent of the Hanford waste. The Energy Department decided two decades ago to turn Hanford's tank waste into glass logs but the new report said innovations in grouting technology now make that process more attractive. No tank waste has yet been treated at Hanford despite Energy Department spending of more than \$19 billion, the report said. — AP

ETHIOPIA DEADLY LANDSLIDE SPARKS LAND RIGHTS BATTLE

ADDIS ABABA: Aworar Meka had been living and working at the Reppi rubbish dump in Addis Ababa for only one month when tragedy struck. A giant landslide at the 50-year-old dump, the Ethiopian capital's only landfill site, hit his neighborhood on March 11, destroying dozens of homes and killing at least 115 people. Meka was one of the lucky ones; the 28-year-old, his wife, and young son survived. Their home, a makeshift tent made of tarpaulin and corrugated iron, narrowly avoided being crushed.

"It was only chance that we escaped," Meka told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. But more than six weeks on, he and the other 30-odd households relocated to one of the governmentbuilt housing project down the road from Reppi feel angry and abandoned. "We expected help to come. But it was a false hope," Meka said. Survivors resettled in another project, several kilometers away in a place called Asko, said they had been told not to talk to the media.

state officials still believe the best way to safely deal with the waste and protect the environment is by turning it into glass.

"We remain firm in our conviction that vitrification, or glass, is the superior process," said Alex Smith, manager for the state's Department of Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program. There have been numerous delays in treating the waste stored in tanks at Hanford. Smith said state officials fear a study on a different way to deal with the waste could "redirect critical funding away from the ongoing work to get treatment processes up and running by 2023."

US Sen Maria Cantwell, a Washington Democrat, also voiced concerns that launching a new study could delay the

Meka was one of hundreds of people who lived near the dump, many of whom made a living scavenging recyclable waste that can be sold on, like plastic bottles. Some of his neighbors were longtime residents with comfortable houses on plots of land they owned. Many had moved there after their shanty town homes in other parts of the city had been demolished to make way for new development, since the land around Reppi was cheap. By the time Meka and his family arrived in the area it was no longer so affordable, with upmarket developments encircling the dump and high-rise construction visible in the near distance. was finally rehabilitated drove prices skywards.

He and others like him became what the city's authorities called "squatters" - informal settlers without title to the land they build on whose numbers have multiplied in the last decade as Addis Ababa's population has exploded. After the landslide Meka and 78 other households were defined by the authorities as "category four victims" - the largest and most vulnerable of four categories ranging from formal residents with land title, to renters and finally squatters. The city's authorities said victims like Meka would be offered rental housing in government-built homes for which they would pay as little as 30-80

Ethiopian birr (\$1.32-\$3.51) a month.

If they could prove their status as former Reppi residents, local authorities would also give them 15,410 birr a month for the next three months to pay for food and transport and to help them get back on their feet. Most, like Meka, have lost their only source of income since leaving the dump. But unlike former formal settlers, they will not receive a plot of land with new title deeds, nor the one million birr compensation per household promised for constructing new homes. "We don't want them to develop dependency syndrome," said Dagmawit Moyes, spokesman for Addis Ababa city administration. — Reuters





Leading soprano brings new life to lost Meyerbeer

n the first half of the 19th century, Giacomo Meyerbeer was perhaps the world's most successful opera composer, pioneering on-stage theatrics as he worked comfortably across European cultures. Meyerbeer's fame faded after his death in 1864. But as part of a revival, German soprano Diana Damrau has released a new album devoted entirely to arias, some obscure, by Meyerbeer. Damrau, whose bursting yet lush and agile coloratura voice has increasingly made her a top attraction at opera houses around the world, said that a Meyerbeer album had long been a career goal.

"This idea was a dream," said the 45-year-old, whose nonchalant smile and giggly laugh belie the grim stock image of a diva. "Meyerbeer: Grand Opera," her album which came out on Friday, runs from selections from the composer's best-known operas, "Les Huguenots" and "Robert le diable," to two arias that have never before been recorded.

She also sings from Meyerbeer's "Dinorah" which she said had served as an introduction to coloratura, the vocal art characterized by quick-paced high notes, trills and other ornamentations.

"I don't come from a musical background and I didn't grow up in the opera house like some of my colleagues did. What you hear when you search for a coloratura soprano repertoire is naturally 'Dinorah," she told AFP in New York, where she is taking part in

a gala Sunday to mark the Metropolitan Opera's 50 years at Lincoln Center.

An innovator, then shunned

More than most composers, Meyerbeer, a German Jew, felt at ease in multiple languages. His most celebrated operas were in French but he also wrote in German and Italian and brought in Orientalist motifs that were then fashionable in Europe. He was instrumental in creating the modern concept of a grand opera, with professional librettos and elaborate productions to enhance the drama, including-at the 1849 premiere of "Le Prophete" at the Paris Opera-the first use on stage of electric lighting.

Amid his success, he was viciously attacked by Richard Wagner, whose grandiose style would be embraced by the Third Reich. Wagner, who had earlier enjoyed support from Meyerbeer, denounced him in the anti-Semitic essay "Judaism in Music" as uncreative and cravenly following popular taste. The Nazi effort to purge Jewish cultural influences took a toll on Meyerbeer's legacy but he has found a new audience in recent years.

The Deutsche Oper Berlin is producing Meyerbeer's operas as a cycle-calling him the capital's "greatest ever composer"-and the Royal Opera House in London in 2012 staged "Robert le diable" for the first time in more than a century. Beyond anti-Semitism, Meyerbeer's work faces impedimentshis operas generally require sprawling casts and are strikingly long for 21st-century attention spans, with the recent Berlin production of "Les Huguenots" running five hours.

An earlier pan-European

While hesitating to draw connections to the present day, Damrau noted that Meyerbeer showed a fluency in three languages and cultures long before the era of European integration. "On one CD, it sounds like there are three composers, but there is only one," Damrau said. "And that in a time when traveling, connections, multimedia, social media, all of this did not exist in the way it does now. How difficult it was, and how unthinkable for so many of his contemporaries."

Damrau herself shows comfort singing in multiple languages. She is married to a French opera singer, Nicolas Teste. The wife-husband duo recently completed a tour of South America, a trip Damrau described as "amazing" as she sensed a hunger in the region for opera. Damrau had performed nearly constantly for 15 years, during which she had two children, until 2015 when doctors told her to stay silent for six weeks. "Sometimes one concert or more can be too much. The body says, maybe you should give me a little rest," she said. "You can never plan it. You have visions, but the reality is always different." — AFP

MTV celebrates summer viewing season with Movie & TV Awards

TV is heralding the start of summer viewing season with its Movie & TV Awards. Formerly known as the MTV Movie Awards, TV shows are newly eligible for Golden Popcorn trophies at this year's ceremony, which broadcasted live yesterday from the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles. MTV is also breaking down gender barriers in its new format, with men and women competing together in the acting categories.

The show is keeping up its traditional irreverence, though, with awards recognizing the best hero, villain, kiss and duo across television and film. Several new categories were added this year: Best American Story,

for the program or film that "showcases America at its best"; Best Fight against the System, which celebrates underdog efforts and social justice; top trending moment; and best musical moment.

The horror hit "Get Out" leads all nominees with six bids, including movie of the year. "Beauty and the Beast" and the Netflix series "Stranger Things" have four nominations each. The cast of the "Fast and Furious" franchise will receive the Generation Award, which Vin Diesel is set to accept. Hosted by actor Adam Devine, the MTV Movie & TV Awards will also feature sneak peeks of anticipated films including "Transformers: The Last Knight" and "Spider-Man: Homecoming."—AP

Conrad Hilton arrested for alleged car theft in LA

Paris Hilton's younger brother, Conrad Hilton, has been arrested in Los Angeles for allegedly stealing a car and violating an ex-girlfriend's restraining order. Police say the 23-year-old Hilton Hotel heir was arrested shortly before 5 am Saturday at a home in the

Hollywood Hills. He allegedly was in a Bentley owned by his ex-girlfriend's father.

Hilton was booked for grand theft auto and violating a restraining order and jailed on \$60,000 bail. It wasn't immediately clear whether he had obtained a lawyer. Hilton has had a series

of run-ins with the law. He was arrested two years ago inside his ex-girlfriend's home. He also received probation for threatening British Airways flight attendants. Last year, he spent two months in jail for violating that probation by using cocaine and other drugs. — AP

Barbra Streisand ponders 'what might have been' with Clinton

Barbra Streisand usually talks to her audience, but Saturday night she had a special message for two guests: Bill and Hillary Clinton. Streisand gave former president and former Democratic presidential candidate much more than a shout out at her concert at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, her hometown. She noted that she performed at President Clinton's inauguration and then went on to list his accomplishments, including lowering taxes for some and raising taxes on the rich.

"And speaking of taxes, he showed us his tax returns," she said, a dig at Republican President Donald Trump, who has refused to release his. She also introduced Hillary Clinton as "the winner of our country's popular vote." She later talked about hearing a recent interview by Hillary Clinton and said it "makes us yearn for what could have been, what should have been. I was thrilled to hear yourself describe yourself as an activist citizen and part of the resistance." Taking another shot at Trump and his tweeting habits, she quipped: "Usually when a man that age is up at 4 am, he forgot to take his Flomax," referring to a medication to treat the prostate.

Despite the Trump barbs, she called for a bridging of the political divide before breaking into "Happy Days Are Here Again."

Miley Cyrus takes to Instagram to clarify hip-hop, rap remarks

iley Cyrus says she respects and appreciates all genres of music, but is gravitating now to "more uplifting, conscious rap," with an eye to giving the younger generation a more positive message with her own music. The pop star took to Instagram over the weekend to clarify remarks in a recent interview that some have seen as denigrating hip-hop music and rap lyrics.

"So, to be clear I respect ALL artists who speak their truth and appreciate ALL genres of music," Cyrus wrote Friday. "I have always and will continue to love and celebrate hip hop as I've collaborated with some of the very best!" But, she added, "At this point in my life I am expanding personally/musically and gravitating more towards uplifting, conscious rap!"

In a Billboard magazine interview published online Wednesday, Cyrus gave a generic example of sexually explicit lyrics about women, and said that such lyrics "pushed me out of the hiphop scene a little." On Instagram, Cyrus added that as she gets older, she understands the




effect music has on the world. "I feel the younger generation needs to hear positive powerful lyrics!" she wrote.

Cyrus also told Billboard that she hadn't smoked marijuana in three weeks - the longest she's ever gone without it. The 24-year-old former Disney star also said she had been surprised by the reaction to her much-discussed twerking performance at the MTV Music Video Awards in 2013, alongside Robin Thicke. Cyrus is promoting an upcoming album. Its lead single, "Malibu," is set to be released Thursday. She said her new music is unlike anything she has recorded before.—AP







Fancy a noodle burger? East meets West in Indonesian fusion food

rom a restaurant serving burgers and pizzas made with local noodles to a social media star giving street food a touch of haute cuisine, a new wave of innovative chefs are putting a modern twist on Indonesia's traditional fare. New eateries have sprung up rapidly in recent years in the capital Jakarta offering a wide array of foreign foods to cater to a growing consumer class which has emerged after a long economic boom.

But rather than focus entirely on cuisine from overseas, some chefs decided to fuse the new influences with age-old Indonesian foods. One eatery offering fusion food is "Mammamie", whose name is a playful take on an Italian expression of shock combined with the local word for noodles, "mie". It uses the country's favorite instant noodles, Indomie-cheap blocks of fodder in colorful packaging that are sold at almost every grocery store and supermarket-to make Western dishes.

Among the most popular are the "mizza", a pizza whose base is made out of noo-

dles, and a "merger", a burger which has buns fashioned from Indomie. It also serves burrito, quesadillas and sushi dishes made with the noodles. Cafe owner Muhammad Luqman Baehaqi said he was trying to appeal to young Indonesians who were keen to try Western foods but still enjoyed Indomie.

"There isn't a single Indonesian person that doesn't know Indomie," the 39-year-old said. "It's tasty and familiar to all of us." The small cafe can seat about 20 people on chairs designed to look like Indomie packing cases and has a distinctly hipster vibe, with young office workers enjoying dishes that cost the equivalent of about two to four dollars under an image of late Apple founder Steve Jobs.

Gourmet street food

While the "Mammamie" cafe uses Indonesian ingredients to spice up Western dishes, Jakarta chef Dede Akbar is taking local dishes as his starting point, and seeking to make them classier. In his brightlydecorated kitchen, the 34-year-old carefully placed two blocks of tempe-a traditional soybean patty-onto a plate. He blowtorched a hard-boiled egg and added small flowers as a garnish before artistically dripping sauce across the dish.

Satisfied with his creation, he took out a camera and snapped pictures from various angles, before uploading them to Instagram. It was his popular Instagram account "Warteg Gourmet", which currently has about 40,000 followers that catapulted him to fame. Wartegs are modest stalls or kiosks selling cheap food, often cramped spaces on street corners where blue-color workers stop for a bite and to smoke a cigarette.

But rather than drab dishes for people

earning low incomes, Akbar said he celebrates warteg food as it has "different textures and a wide range of colors that we can play with". Akbar was inspired to make hautecuisine, warteg-style food after becoming annoyed at the careless presentation of dishes at the traditional streetside eateries.

What started off as a hobby became an obsession, and eventually Akbar found he was receiving so many invites to be a "food stylist" at events that he quit his day job as an advertising agency art director to become a full-time chef. He hopes his efforts can help raise the profile of humble Indonesian street food, which is not as wellknown as local cuisine from other parts of Asia, such as Thailand.

"I want to make Indonesian food more appreciated by Indonesians in general and recognized internationally," he said. — AFP
