Palestinians bury dead, including journalist, killed by Israeli fire

Thousands march for Gaza • US rejects Kuwaiti statement on violence

GAZA CITY: Palestinian mourners in the Gaza Strip yesterday buried their dead, including a journalist, after Israeli troops killed nine during the latest border clashes in a week of bloodshed. Thousands of protesters approached the border fence around Gaza for a second Friday in a row, burning tyres and hurling stones at Israeli forces, who responded with tear gas and live ammunition. In addition to the nine dead, at least 491 were wounded by Israeli gunfire, the health ministry in the Hamas-run enclave said.

Israel said there were around 20,000 protesters and that they were seeking to breach the border. Numbers were down from the previous Friday, when tens of thousands approached the border in demonstrations that saw Israeli forces kill 19 Palestinians, making it the bloodiest day in Gaza since a 2014 war. The demonstrations largely abated by yesterday, but three Palestinians were wounded by Israeli forces in a small clash east of Gaza City in the afternoon, one of them seriously, according to the Palestinian health ministry. No Israelis were injured on either day and the latest deaths have sparked fresh calls for an investigation.



MoCI to strictly enforce law

KUWAIT: The ministry of commerce and industry plans to firmly apply a new law on recruiting household labor, a senior official warned yesterday. The ministry recently set the cost of employing domestic labor through a company at KD 990 (\$3,267) and KD 390 (\$1,287) by individuals. Strict penalties will be imposed on recruitment companies that do not commit to the ceiling imposed by the ministry, which could amount to a shutdown of the office and the confiscation of its license. - KUNA

MONTREAL: Hockey-mad Canada was in mourning yesterday after a bus carrying a junior ice hockey team collided with a semi-trailer truck in Saskatchewan province, killing 14 people. In a country where love of the sport is almost a religion, the crash sparked an outpouring of grief among players and fans on social media, while national political leaders expressed their sympathies. "We can now confirm 14 people have died as a result of this collision," the Royal Canadian Mounted Police said in a statement.

'Mentally ill' man smashes van into German restaurant

MUENSTER, Germany: A man drove a van into a group of people sitting outside a popular restaurant in the old city center of Muenster in western Germany yesterday, killing at least two of them before shooting himself dead, police said. The vehicle ploughed into people sitting at tables outside the Grosser Kiepenkerl restaurant, which is popular with tourists. "At 15:27 (1327 GMT), a vehicle drove into the outside area of the restaurant ... three people were killed, 20 injured, and six of those seriously injured," police spokesman Andreas Bode said, adding: "The perpetrator killed himself in the vehicle.'

It was not immediately clear whether the perpetrator was among the three killed, or whether his death took the number of dead to four. A police spokeswoman said separately that there were at least three people dead. A security source said the perpetrator was probably German. The Sueddeutsche Zeitung said the man was a German with psychological problems who had no ter-

He also advised and encouraged everyone to practice recycling and if necessary reduce the use of plastic materials. "Less plastic deposited into landfills means less plastic that finds its way into fragile marine environments here in Kuwait and around the world."

Dr Dari Al-Huwail of the Kuwait Dive Team thanked the US Embassy for the collaborative work to clean the beachfront in Anjafa in Salwa. "We really need to give something back to our environment and the surrounding we live in. If we do not care about our environment, we are ruining the future and generations of people, and this is a recipe for disaster. Just imagine throwing a





plastic bottle and leaving it in the world for more than 450 years – a plastic bottle will decompose only after 450 years," he said.

KISR completes fish farming project in line with Kuwait New Vision 2035

KSE urges more safety precautions on various roads

KUWAIT: Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research has successfully completed a fish farming project aimed at fulfilling domestic demand and providing local investors with spaces for produce. The project includes four types of fish and shellfish, and aims to attain food security in the country through decreasing exports of the food commodity in line with Kuwait's New Vision 2035. Currently, enclosures only provide 20 percent of local consumption the rest of which is exported into the country from overseas producers, KISR director general Samira Omar said. According to figures, fish farming around the world provided 77 million tons in 2015, which covered 50 percent of global demand, she said, making aquaculture one of the most crucial and fastest growing industries.

KISR enclosures now produce Barramundi fish, which bears resemblance to the popularly consumed Seabass, giant tiger prawn, giant river prawn and giant crab. All four species can withstand Kuwait's hot climate and have been successfully raised in waters with similar scorching conditions, including Australia and Southeast Asia, she added. These species were selected due to their rapidgrowth characteristics in a short time, the institute's fish farming researcher Amani Al-Yagout said. She added that domestic demand could be met within a period of 6-8 months. The institute plans to later introduce the program to investors, who will reap the benefits of being able to produce 40 kg of fish for every square meter.

More safety precautions

Kuwait Society of Engineers (KSE) stressed the need for more safety precautions on various roads, namely highways with limited capacity. KSE Secretary Fahd Erdaini Al-Otaibi extended the society's condolences to the families of the victims recently killed in a traffic accident along the southern highways, noting that the society had previously warned that those highways are too narrow.

Environmental concerns

Kuwait Environment Protection Society

(KEPS) conducted a survey on various social media networks with the aim of boosting public awareness of environmental concerns and climate change. The questionnaire included 24 elements and was conducted on 1,000 participants of various age categories. KEPS Secretary General Jenan Bahzad said 6 percent of participants got their information about the environment from newspaper and magazines, 28 percent from TV and radio, 70 percent from social media and 5 percent from public bodies. She added that 18 percent of the participants are in favor of using alternative energy.


Taxes on remittances



The announcement of the parliamentary finance committee that it is preparing a draft law to impose taxes on expat remittances created controversy in most Kuwaiti financial circles. I followed most of what has been published and found out that there are more opponents than supporters of this issue. Data from the Central Bank confirms that the average remittances in Kuwait exceed KD 4 billion annually (up to \$15 billion), which makes the expected revenues from the transfers about KD 150 million, equivalent to \$500 million.

If this law is approved, then Kuwait will be the first country in the Gulf region to pass such a law, imposing a direct tax on the remittances of expatriates. The UAE and Saudi Arabia began imposing value added taxes since the beginning of 2018 of 5 percent only on the transfer fees. Kuwait is supposed to impose VAT next year, but I wonder how the government will maintain the balance between the imposition of tax on expatriate money transfers and the 5 percent VAT which is to be applied on the transfer fees. I find this very confusing. According to the parliamentary financial committee, the remittance tax will range from 1 to 5 percent. The new law suggests penalties against those who don't deal with official banks and exchange companies. I guess they need to add such penalties to warn those who may try to ignore the law if it's approved and applied. It is known that banks and money exchange shops are the primary sources of remittances, but it is not done for free. These entities make financial gains and annual profits, so of course they fear a possible loss due to the possible formation of a black market for remittances abroad. I think their concern is justified. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is conservative on the subject and fears negative effects if the draft law is approved. I think since many experts and financial authorities believe that imposing a tax on expatriate transfers is a bad idea, maybe new and practical suggestions can be presented that can be for the benefit of both sides. For example, if imposing tax on expatriate remittances will not be effective in improving the sources of income or filling the budget deficit, maybe allowing expatriates to own their own homes, especially those who have lived here with their families for a long time in Kuwait, can contribute to improving income sources, as in other countries. I know that most countries in the world impose a tax on individuals and companies and we hardly have a country today that provides totally free services. But if Kuwait couldn't apply VAT this year like UAE and Saudi Arabia due to administrative and operational burdens, how can it apply strict financial control to expatriate transfers? Clearly, this issue needs a revision and reevaluation of its economic feasibility and possible risks.







Lawmakers aim to boost diplomacy

TUNIS: Kuwaiti MP Askaar Al-Enezi has said that parliamentary diplomacy plays a major role for enhancing inter-state ties. Al-Enezi made the statement to KUNA as a Kuwaiti parliamentary friendship delegation arrived in Tunisia yesterday on a five-day visit. The visit is part of the Kuwaiti National Assembly's endeavors to bolster parliamentary diplomacy for consolidating ties with legislative bodies in other countries, he added. Al-Enezi emphasized the deep-rooted relations between the two countries, saying their leaderships have been pushing ahead toward further consultation and cooperation. — Agencies

KUWAIT: Kuwait Fire Services Directorate's Deputy Director General of the Prevention Affairs Sector Major Gen Khalid Al-Abdullah Al-Sabah visited the Jaber Al-Ahmad Causeway project, which is among the largest development projects in the country. It is also the longest marine bridge in the world at 37 km and links Kuwait with Subbiya. Khalid Al-Abdullah said the visit was made on the instructions of KFSD Director General to inspect the bridge and make sure it meets fire prevention conditions. He said the causeway was found to meet most requirements. Major Gen Khalid Al-Abdullah was accompanied by Director of the Capital Prevention Department Sulafa Al-Yaseen and other officials.

Kuwait reaffirms solidarity with UK in poisoning case

NEW YORK: Kuwait Representative to the UN said his country stands by the United Kingdom in whatever measures it might take to determine the culprits in the poisoning of Sergei Skripal, a Russian ex-spy, and his daughter Yulia in Salisbury town early last month. Speaking on behalf of Kuwait at a UN Security Council session, Ambassador Mansour Al-Otaibi expressed regret over the incident and welcomed the call to involve the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) in the investigations.

At a Russian request, the Council opened this session on Thursday under the theme of "UK letter to the Security Council," in reference to a letter dated March 14, 2018, where the UK said it is "highly likely" that Russia is behind nerve-agent attack on Skripal and Yulia. Russia denies any role in the incident. The OPCW is an impartial and specialized UN agency that could contribute in unveiling the truth and determining those responsible for the attack, Ambassador Al-Otaibi said, expressing wish for quick recovery for the two victims.

He also voiced profound concern over the growing challenges facing the UN efforts to prevent the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction (WMDs), including the chemical weapons. Kuwait is firmly against proliferation, production and storing of WMDs and denounces any use or threat to use such weapons, whether directly or indirectly whatever the justifications might be, Al-Otaibi stressed.

Kuwait's stance is based on the provisions of the first article of the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC), he added, noting that Kuwait joined the Convention in 1997. Ahmet Uzumcu, the OPCW Director-General, said the results of tests of samples collected from individuals exposed to a nerve agent in Salisbury are expected to be received by early next week. "Once the results of the analyses of the samples are received, the Secretariat will produce a report on the basis of these results and will transmit a copy of this report to the United Kingdom," he told the OPCW Executive Council. - KUNA

Security Council fails to approve Kuwait's draft on Gaza violence

Kuwaiti appointed first Arab League observer at UN Geneva office

NEW YORK: The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) failed late Friday to approve Kuwait's draft press statement on the Israeli use of brute force against innocent Palestinians in the Gaza Strip. This is the second statement of its kind in response to the use of brutal force by Israeli against protestors in the Gaza Strip, which resulted so far in the death of 10 people and the injury of over 1,000 others.

The statements called for launching an independent investigation into the evident violation of human rights carried out by Israel against Palestinians who should be allow to peacefully protest against those causing them harm. Before submitting the document earlier Friday, the permanent representative of Kuwait to the UN Ambassador Mansour Al-Otaibi hoped that no member country would object the statement anew.

Kuwait, during the session, distributed a draft press statement but the US objected it. "The wording did not represent the position of Kuwait or the Arabs to what is happening in Gaza, but Kuwait wanted it to be balanced and acceptable by all parties," said Al-Otaibi. Kuwait, he added, has always supported Palestinian legitimate rights and that the Security Council should act to what was happening in Gaza. He urged UN Secretary General to conduct an independent and transparent investigation into killing of Palestinian people, who have been protesting peacefully.

Al-Otaibi also said Israeli authorities, the occupying power, should exercise self-restraint, respect international human rights and humanitarian law, as well as respect right of people to peaceful demonstration. Kuwait will always call upon the international community to hold Israeli authorities accountable legally, politically and morally for "the massacres committed against the Palestinian protesters," which killed more people including children. Last week, Kuwait called for an urgent UN Security Council session last week to discuss developments in Gaza when Israeli forces shot dead 15 Palestinians and injured over 1,400 others.

Arab League observer

In another development, Kuwaiti Ambassador Ali Al-Sammak submitted his credentials to Director-General of UN Office in Geneva Michael Moller as the Arab League's permanent observer there. Al-Sammak, the first Kuwaiti ambassador to hold the post, was named observer by the 149th Session of the Arab League Council (Foreign Ministers) in Cairo in March. Meanwhile, Al-Sammak and Moller agreed to work harder for further cooperation to facilitate the task of the League's mission to the UN Geneva Office. Al-Sammak was Kuwait's ambassador to Canada (2010-2016). He was Director of the Americas Department at the Kuwaiti Foreign Ministry (2008-2010). In 2003, he was Ambassador of State to Argentina, and earlier envoy to the Netherlands (1991). From 1885 to 1991 he was councilor at the Kuwaiti embassy in Brussels and deputy chief of the Kuwaiti mission to the European Economic Community (EEC) -(the European Union). —Agencies

Conflicts, violence and fundamentalism prevent development

BAKU: Global conflicts and the spread of violence and fundamentalism have made achieving sustainable development very unlikely, a Kuwaiti official told fellow Non-Aligned Movement (NAM) member countries meeting in Baku, Azerbaijan, on Friday. Through its NAM membership and its Security Council February presidency, Kuwait has worked to highlight the movement's principles, through addressing the concerns and interests of its member countries, he said in a speech to fellow delegates.

Kuwait remains committed to the principles of the 118-member country movement, founded in 1955, Assistant Foreign Minister for International Organizations Naser Al-Hayyen said, based on the unbiased respect of the UN Charter and human rights. Al-Hayyen tackled several concerns, including global terrorism, Palestinian affairs, the Syrian and Yemeni conflicts and Iraq's reconstruction efforts following its military defeat of the Islamic State group. He reiterated Kuwait's unwavering condemnation of terrorism, mentioning its contributions to providing logistic support and hosting several meetings for the global anti-Islamic State group coalition.

But, he said, the Palestinian issue remains the single most fundamental factor to Arab countries, condemning the recent US recognition of Jerusalem as Israel's capital city as a unilateral action that has disregarded any likely legal, political and religious implications as a result. The move represents a "new challenge" to the region and the rest of the world and is a breach of inter-

national laws and regulations, he said, warning of long-term repercussions that could turn the matter into a religious war to the benefit of extremists in the region.

At the Security Council, Kuwait as a non-permanent member, arranged a special session on the matter, he recalled. At the recent session, it underlined the need to grant the Palestinian people their full legitimate rights and to recognize Palestine as an independent state with a capital of East Jerusalem according to the 1967 borders, the UN land for peace treaty and the Arab Peace Initiative.

Al-Hayyen also warned of the dangers of the limiting of funds provided to the UN Palestinian refugee agency, UNRWA, saying this would have a negative impact on regional security due to increasing poverty, unemployment and crime in the Palestinian territories. Kuwait remains at the forefront of providing support for the UN agency, granting assistance worth \$150 million in recent years and voluntary annual contributions to the agency's budget, he mentioned.

On the conflict in Syria, he reiterated Kuwait's position on the matter calling for a political solution, not violence, as the only means to resolve the

eight-year conflict. Kuwait along with Sweden co-worded UNSC resolution 2401, which received the majority backing of members and called for a 30-day ceasefire across Syria enabling the facilitation of UN-administered humanitarian and food aid, he added. The Gulf nation, under the directions of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, also co-hosted a conference of global donors for reconstruction projects in Iraq after the defeat of Islamic State, resulting in pledges worth \$30 billion, including \$2 billion from Kuwait.

He also reiterated Kuwait's commitment to Yemen's sovereignty, stressing that the solution to its conflict should be based on the three references, including the Gulf Cooperation Council Initiative, the national dialogue and UNSC resolution 2216. Kuwait firmly stands by Saudi Arabia and fully supports its actions aimed at protecting its security and stability in light of ballistic missile attacks carried out by Houthi militia, underlined the Kuwaiti diplomat. The Houthi's actions run in contradiction to international law, UNSC resolutions and the international community's efforts to attain peace in Yemen, he concluded. — KUNA

Kuwait living up to UN recognition as 'International Humanitarian Center'

Weekly roundup of Kuwait's humanitarian action

KUWAIT: Living up to its UN recognition as 'International initiative by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Humanitarian Center', Kuwait continued assisting needy people in a number of countries in the region throughout the week. In Irbil, head of Barzani Charity Foundation Mousa Ahmad said that Kuwait has provided enormous humanitarian assistance to more than 43,000 displaced and refugee people in Iraq's Kurdistan region. He said in a statement that it is expected that many of those displaced families living in shelters would return after the liberation of their towns from the so-called Islamic State.

He noted that those who returned to the liberated areas are suffering from severe shortage of basic services. He referred that Kuwait, in collaboration with Barzani foundation, has distributed about 7,000 food packages to the families who returned to the liberated areas. Meanwhile, Kuwait paid for conducting operations on fitting prosthetic limbs to 60 patients in Mosul, within a campaign which has covered so far 322 cases. The cam-

paign is funded by the Kuwait Society for Relief and Kuwait Red Crescent Society, and supervised by Kuwait's general consulate in Irbil.

General consul in Irbil Mohammad Al-Kanderi said in a statement to KUNA that Kuwait covered expenses of making prosthetic limbs for those injured in military operations in Mosul. More than 266 cases were treated in a specialized center for prosthetic limbs in Irbil over the last period, he stated. This campaign is in line with the great

Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah calling for standing by the Iraqi people through offering different humanitarian aid, he ointed out.

Meanwhile, Kuwait distributed 30 tons of food for displaced Iraqis in Sulaymaniyah, North Iraq, in Irbil. More han 1,000 food packages were distributed to 500 families under the supervision of Kuwait's General Consulate, funded by Kuwait Society for Relief and Secretary-General of Awqaf, said head of Barzani foundation Ismael Abdulaziz in remarks to KUNA. He added the displaced families from Tuzhermatu were in dire need of humanitarian supplies due to extreme shortage in social services and lack of income.

Kurdistan region

Abdulaziz expressed his thanks to Kuwait and its organizations for its various humanitarian assistance to the displaced and the poor as well as people with special

needs. "In light of difficult economic conditions experienced by the Kurdistan region, such aid helps to alleviate suffering of the displaced people, and support local government," he noted. In 2018, Kuwait started a relief plan to help displaced people of Kurdistan region by distributing more than 40,000 food packages to people returning to their homes in Mosul, and people of Irbil, Sulaymaniyah and Halabja.

In Baghdad, the United Iraqi Medical Association for Relief and Development, the liaison of the Kuwaiti Society for Relief, has begun distributing a large number of food baskets to families returning to Kirkuk province, north of Baghdad. Ahmad Al-Heiti, head of the Iraqi association, told KUNA on Saturday that 1,025 food baskets were distributed today to those families, within the framework of the "Kuwait by your side" campaign.

He added that about 5,000 food packages were doled out to the families over some days in a row. Every basket is 30 kgs and included rice, sugar, tea, flour, oil and basic needs, he noted. The campaign offered support to displaced families over the last period that included the distribution of aid and the building of schools and medical centers. In Geneva, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Khaled Al-Jarallah said Kuwait is pledging \$250 million to international relief aid efforts in Yemen this year.

In Kuwait's speech to the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs' (OCHA) 2018 Yemen High-Level Pledging Event, Al-Jarallah said that this donation would hopefully help the Yemenis survive the upheavals they are facing in their country. The donation came in line with His Highness the Amir of Kuwait and UN humanitarian leader Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah's directives to aid the fellow Yemenis, said Al-Jarallah who indicated that the pledge came on time especially with the nearing of the month of Ramadan in mid-May.

Al-Jarallah said that his country took all necessary steps to find a resolution to the Yemeni crisis, indicating that several inter-Yemeni meetings were organized by Kuwait to find a political solution to the dilemma. He said that the resolution to the Yemeni crisis must be based on

the tenets of the GCC peace initiative, the outcomes of the national Yemeni dialogue, and UNSC resolution 2216 regarding the end of violence in Yemen. Al-Jarallah called on the Houthi militias to abide by international laws and stressed that national unity is the only way to end the situation in Yemen.

He took the chance to condemn the Houthi's ballistic missile attacks launched from

Yemeni territory towards Saudi Arabia, affirming that the State of Kuwait was against such vile acts. Al-Jarallah urged the international community to gather three billion dollars to support relief aid efforts in Yemen this year, saying that its an humanitarian obligation. Al-Jarallah thanked the Saudi-led Arab coalition for Yemen in its efforts to provide assistance to the Yemenis and also expressed gratitude towards the Swiss Confederation, Kingdom of Sweden, and OCHA for organizing the one-day high-level pledging event.

Loan to Lebanon

In another development, Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) will grant Lebanon a loan worth \$500 million over five years. KFAED Director

General Abdulwahab Al-Bader made the announcement in his address to the Cedar conference for supporting Lebanon's economy in Paris. He reiterated Kuwait's continued backing to Lebanon till it restores its past economic status. The sharp fall of Lebanon's economy to an annual growth rate of just 1 percent is a main concern of the Kuwaitis and Lebanese, Al-Bader said. He urged "friendly and sisterly countries" to support Lebanon which "experienced hard conditions over the past years." The Kuwaiti delegation to the Paris conference includes a host of officials from the fund and the foreign ministry. - Agencies

Fresh raids pound Syria's rebel-held Douma

Negotiations crumbled this week and air strikes resumed

BEIRUT: Deadly bombardments pounded the last opposition holdout in Syria's Eastern Ghouta yesterday, after regime troops resumed a military blitz to pressure rebels to withdraw. Backed up by Russia's firepower, Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad has ousted his armed opponents from nearly all of Ghouta, their last stronghold on the edge of the capital. The regime has used a combination of a fierce military onslaught and two negotiated withdrawals to empty out 95 percent of the enclave, but rebels are still entrenched in its largest town of Douma.

As Moscow pursued talks with Jaish Al-Islam, the Islamist faction that holds Douma, bombing subsided and military operations appeared to be on hold for around ten days. But the negotiations crumbled this week and air strikes resumed on Friday, killing 40 civilians according to the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights.

Another eight civilians were killed yesterday as more bombing raids slammed into the town, the Britain-based Observatory said. It could not confirm whether the strikes were carried out by Syrian government warplanes or those of its ally, Russia. Firas Al-Doumi, a rescue worker inside the battered town, told AFP military planes and helicopters were circling overhead. "The bombing has not stopped. We can't even count all the wounded," said Mohammed, a young doctor inside Douma. "There are some wounded who we couldn't operate on in time, and they died," he said.

'Douma is the end'

Six civilians were also killed and dozens more wounded as Douma rebels shelled the capital Damascus yesterday, Syrian state media said. State television broadcast live footage from a hospital in

Damascus, where pools of blood stained the floor and wounded could be heard wailing in pain. One woman cried over the lifeless body of a young man on a stretcher. Another said she had been riding in a taxi when the shelling started, and the car crashed head-on into a wall.

Assad is keen to recapture Ghouta to eliminate the opposition from the outskirts of

Damascus and end years of rocket fire on the capital. Abbas, a retired 57-year-old Syrian man, said his neighborhood in the capital's west was being hit hard yesterday. "It looks like Douma is the end of the story, and endings are

always hard," he said. "I'm waiting for the end of the fighters in Douma so people can live in peace. We've been waiting for this for years, whether in Ghouta or in Damascus," said Abbas.

The regime's offensive on Ghouta since February 18 has killed more than 1,600 civilians. It sliced the area into three isolated pockets each held by different rebel factions.

The first two were evacuated under Russian-brokered deals last month that saw more than 46,000 rebels and civilians bussed to opposition-held Idlib province in the northwest. Tens of thousands also fled into governmentcontrolled territory through safe passages opened by Russia and Syrian troops.

Talks falter

Moscow stepped in to negotiate a deal for Douma, the third and final pocket where Jaish Al-Islam had been angling for a reconciliation agreement that would allow them to stay as a police force. Following a preliminary accord announced by Russia on

Sunday, nearly 3,000 fighters and civilians were evacuated from Douma to northern Syria.

But as talks dragged on, Syria and its Russian ally threatened Jaish Al-Islam with a renewed military assault if they did not agree to withdraw.

It remains unclear exactly why the talks fell apart this week. SANA said they faltered when Jaish Al-Islam refused to release detainees they were holding in Douma, adding that the military assault would only stop if hostages are released. Others have pointed to internal rebel divisions over the withdrawal process. Top Jaish Al-Islam political figure Mohammad Alloush on Friday blamed power struggles between the regime's allies.

"The talks were going well... Their only shared interests is the blood of civilians," he said. Syrian troops were matching their renewed bombing with a ground operation in the orchards surrounding Douma. Yesterday, fresh artillery fire hit those fields, said the Observatory. "The regime is trying to tighten the noose around Douma from the west, east, and south," said Observatory head Rami Abdel Rahman. Nawar Oliver, an analyst at the Omran Institute, told AFP Jaish Al-Islam was facing "massive" military pressure. "The negotiations failed and the regime wants its conditions-the air strikes are a taste of what could happen if its conditions are not implemented," he said. —AFP

15 years after Saddam's fall, Iraqi hopes fade

BAGHDAD: Fifteen years ago, Abu Ali was thrilled to see American soldiers enter Baghdad. "The tyrant is finished," he remembers saying, imagining a bright future for Iraq without Saddam Hussein. But the years that followed have brought only misery, he said, looking at photos of three of his sons killed in attacks in the ensuing chaos.

After the US-led invasion of 2003, Iraq, freed from nearly a quarter century of dictatorship, descended into violence. Sectarian clashes and jihadist attacks divided families and killed tens of thousands of people, leaving behind wounds that have yet to heal and a lagging economy. In July 2007, Abu Ali's eldest son, 18 at the time, was killed when a car bomb hit a busy street in Baghdad's Karrada neighborhood.

He had been selling watermelons to passers-by trying to escape the summer heat. Six years later almost to the day, the taxi driver's two younger sons, Alaa, 23, and Abbas, 17, were also killed in an attack. The losses are written in deep lines along his face, aged well beyond his 61 years. Abu Ali used to dream of lives for his children that would be better than his own, but now he only visits them at the cemetery. "I go to their graves every week, I feel like they're sitting near me," he said, wearing a white scarf and a traditional beige robe.

'Baghdad fell when statue fell'

Abu Ali's hopes for a brighter future have faded. "The situation does not bode well... no one thinks of the people," he said. "The parties only seek to win seats." Things were different before, said Qais al-Sharea, a hairdresser in the capital. "Saddam Hussein was the strong man, the one who controlled everything and scared the entire world with his chemical weapons," he said.

Each morning, when he opened his salon in Al-Ferdous Square in the heart of Baghdad, the dictator's colossal statue stood guard outside. On April 9, 2003, Sharea, who had stayed at home that day, watched on television as US soldiers with an armoured vehicle helped a crowd armed with a sledgehammer pull down the bronze statue in front of his shop.

"Baghdad fell when the statue fell," he told AFP at the foot of the giant platform, now covered with rubble poorly hidden by crumpled sheet metal-the site of a construction project that has so far failed to take shape. Sharea, 27 at the time, thought "like all young people" that Baghdad would soon be filled with nightclubs and restaurants.


"We (thought) we would travel the world," he said. But instead of progress and opening to the world, life in Iraq has turned into a case of "one step forward and five back", said Sharea. Mahmoud Othman, a 65-year-old Kurdish politician who served as a member of Iraq's transitional leadership after Saddam's fall, dreamed of a better tomorrow. But if "the Americans had a plan to overthrow Saddam Hussein, they had no agenda for post-Saddam", said Othman, who had been a Kurdish peshmerga fighter since the age of 18.

State institutions and Saddam's all-powerful Baath Party were dismantled as opposition figures returned from exile. But corruption and sectarian tensions-fuelled by militias born in the security vacuum created by the dismantling of the security forces-flourished. "We thought we'd have a federal and democratic system, but we've had sectarianism and chauvinism," said Rauf Maaruf, leader of the Kurdish opposition party Goran.

Members of Iraq's religious and ethnic minorities say they have paid the highest price for the past decade-and-a-half of chaos. "Our country has been going through catastrophe after catastrophe," said the Chaldean Catholic patriarch, Louis Raphael Sako, who has watched his community shrink. Every institution has been affected, according to Abdel Salam Al-Samer, a 58-year-old university teacher for the past three decades. "The situation in Iraq has deteriorated and so have our universities," said Samer, who has seen political factions interfere in education and colleagues killed by militias. —AFP

As the Castro era wanes, Cuba's youth have doubts, and dreams

HAVANA: They are the children of the new millennium. Like their parents, they have known no leader but the Castro brothers. Now, on the eve of a historic generational change, Cuba's young people hold conflicting opinions about a future they will help to forge. The island's youth tend to see the announced departure of President Raul Castro, who will pass the mantle of leadership to

a new generation on April 19, as natural and necessary.

"Many generations have passed since the revolution (of 1959) triumphed," said communications major Hayla Torres, evoking 86-year-old Raul Castro and other members of the revolutionary old guard. "But they are people of another time, and

society is demanding change," added the 19-yearold from western Matanzas province, who wore a Real Madrid team shirt tied around her waist.

For the first time in more than 40 years, the Cuban president will not be named Castro and will not come from the generation that spearheaded the revolution. For now, the government's current number two, 57-year-old Miguel Diaz-Canel, is expected to assume the top role. "Time has passed," said Yoendris Alarcon, a 22year-old student at the aptly named University of the Isla de la Juventud (Isle of Youth) in southwest Cuba, adding that it was time to give a new generation a chance to "take Cuba forward." "I have confidence in our future," Torres added. "I believe that despite everything that has been happening, one can see the results of things." She praised the first reforms undertaken by Raul Castro to "update" the Cuban economic model.

'Everything will stay the same'

Others, however, were quick to express their reservations about Raul Castro's legacy and the changes that can be expected ahead. "At the rate things are going, I do not think we'll see improvement," said Marlon Borrero, 19, who is doing his compulsory military service. "I think everything

will stay the same." "Life is complicated for my family," he said, adding that there was little work available and "if you don't work, you don't live." Just to keep up one's weight, Borrero said, "almost requires magic."

The son of a public official, Borrero plans to pursue a career in tourism, probably working "more abroad than in Cuba." He hopes that will take him to the United

States, "because whatever you say, there is a better way of life there. You work a little more, but in the end the sacrifice is worth it," said Borrero, a hiphop fan who sports tattoos and wears earrings and who had decided to grant himself a day off. Yoel, a 24-year-old

unemployed youth in

Havana, said he, too, is skeptical of promised change, and he rejects Cuba's indirect voting system to elect a new president, saying it was designed to keep power in the hands of those who already have it. "The people play no part in that vote, so we continue on the same path," he said. "We will never see change."

'Nothing is impossible'

Yet while many young Cubans are not optimistic, they realize that the island's future rests partly on their shoulders, and they say they are ready to take up the burden. "The young people of Cuba can contribute," said Luis Orlando, a physical education student, as he walked the streets of the south-central city of Cienfuegos. "We need to take this revolution forward."

"I understand that we have to open ourselves more to other countries, market ourselves better... and leave the old thoughts behind if we are to make Cuba better," said Orlando, a soccer fan. Hayla agreed. "The Cuban economy has declined, but nothing will lower the spirit" of the island's youth, who are ready to "play their part," she said. "Nothing is impossible," added Yoendris. "We are going to keep fighting. Everything depends on us putting our heads down and staying in the fight." —AFP

> ment as a kickback from a big construction company. He lost a lower court appeal in January and saw his sentence increased from nine to 12 years. Since Wednesday, Lula and his supporters have been fighting the prison sentence in the Supreme Court, Brazil's top appeals court, and in the streets, in a feverish political drama that has gripped Latin America's biggest nation. On Friday, the founder of the once dominant Workers' Party refused to comply with an order to surrender voluntarily to the authorities. This raised fears of confrontation between police and the seething crowd of Lula backers, many of them in Workers' Party red shirts. However, authorities quickly defused tension by declaring that Lula was not yet considered a fugitive. The endgame now appears to have started. Brazilian media widely reported that Lula was due to turn himself in after the Mass. Lula's lawyers were in negotiations with police over the place and timing of the arrest, allies of the disgraced leader said. But Lula's faithful were still in defiant mood. "We can't let them lock up Lula!" one member of the human shield surrounding the union building yelled. "Don't let him surrender!" another cried.

US congressman pulls loaded gun

WASHINGTON: A US congressman said he pulled out a loaded Smith & Wesson pistol during a meeting with gun control activists Friday in a bid to prove that firearms are not responsible for violence. House Republican Ralph Norman of South Carolina told The Post and Courier newspaper that he drew the handgun and placed it on a table while at a "Coffee With Your Congressman" event at a diner, in an attempt to

convey that guns are only dangerous if in the wrong hands. "I'm not going to be a Gabby Giffords," said Norman, 64, referring to the former congresswoman from Arizona who was shot in the head during a meet-and-greet outside a grocery store in 2011. Giffords was gravely wounded in that attack. She survived and became a prominent gun safety advocate. Both Giffords and her husband, retired NASA astronaut Mark Kelly, are longtime gun owners.

"Americans are increasingly faced with a stark choice: leaders like Gabby, who work hard together to find solutions to problems, or extremists like the NRA and Congressman Norman, who rely on intimidation tactics and perpetuating fear," Kelly said in a statement. "If we want to protect our kids and communities, Congress must get serious about passing safer gun laws. For our kids' sake, let's show our leaders we expect them to behave more like Gabby and less like Congressman Norman."

The paper said Norman also claimed: "I don't mind dying... But whoever shoots me better shoot well or I'm shooting back." Norman's indelicate reference to Giffords appeared to suggest that her debilitating injury was in some way due to her not being adequately armed. The congressman later issued a statement saying he is a concealed carry permit holder and regularly brings his gun with him when in public.—AFP

SAO BERNARDO DO CAMPO: Brazil's election frontrunner and controversial leftist icon Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva yesterday finally walked out of the building where he had been holed up for two days and attended a Catholic Mass ahead of his expected arrest for corruption. Lula, 72, got a rock star's welcome from thousands of leftist supporters surrounding the metalworkers' union building in Sao Bernardo do Campo, where he has defied the authorities.

He had been ordered to surrender on Friday and begin a 12-year sentence. But to the delight of his fervent followers, Lula skipped the deadline, remaining shut up in the building. The unfolding drama mixes Lula's charismatic political style, the country's epic struggle against graft, and the fate of October's presidential elections — where, despite his legal problems, Lula remains by far the most popular contender. Finally emerging yesterday, wearing a dark blue T-shirt and looking confident, Lula waved to the crowd and made the sign of the cross on a platform where he stood next to several priests.

"Free Lula, free Lula!" the crowd chanted. The impromptu Mass in the street was to commemorate Lula's late wife Marisa Leticia, who died last year and would now be turning 68. But it was also a reminder to supporters of Lula's long and often emotional backstory, rising as he did from humble beginnings as an uneducated, desperately poor shoeshine boy to a two-term president (2003-2010), and at his peak, one of the world's most popular politicians. For his followers, the Mass appeared likely to become an elaborate farewell before Lula was taken to Curitiba, headquarters of Brazil's giant "Car Wash" antigraft probe, which has claimed him as its biggest scalp.

Meanwhile, Lula's lawyers appealed for an injunction against his arrest late Friday in the Supreme Court. But a similar appeal at another court failed earlier in the day and the latest effort was unlikely to gain traction.

Polarizing figure To his Workers' Party faithful, Lula is a victim of an outof-control judiciary preventing him from returning to power. They remember him for a presidency that saw tens of millions lifted from poverty and Brazil rise on the world stage. However, Lula's imminent arrest is being celebrated by many Brazilians. The "Car Wash" probe, which has revealed systemic, high-level embezzlement and bribery throughout business and politics over the last four years, is wildly popular.

Detractors say that Lula epitomizes Brazil's corruption-riddled elite. Operation "Car Wash" was named after the service station where agents initially investigated a minor money laundering scheme in 2014, before realizing that they had stumbled on a gargantuan web of embezzlement and bribery at state oil company Petrobras, reaching right through the political classes. —AFP

S Korea's Park jailed for 24 years for corruption

Guilty on multiple criminal charges, including bribery

SEOUL: South Korea's disgraced former president Park Geun-hve was jailed for 24 years Friday for corruption, completing a dramatic fall from grace for the country's first woman leader who became a figure of public fury and ridicule. A trial which lasted more than 10 months and highlighted shady links between big business and politics in South Korea ended with Park being found guilty on multiple criminal charges, including bribery and abuse of power.

Park's successor described the sentencing as a "heartbreaking event" for both the nation and the exleader herself. "The accused abused the power bestowed by the people-the true ruler of this countryto cause chaos in national administration," said Judge Kim Se-yoon, delivering the ruling. Park, 66, was con-

victed of receiving or demanding more than \$20 million from conglomerates, sharing secret state documents, "blacklisting" artists critical of her policies, and firing officials who resisted her abuses of power.

"Despite all these crimes, the accused denied all the charges against her, displayed no remorse and showed an

officials," Kim said, referring to Park's secret confidante and long-time friend Choi Soon-sil. Park was also ordered to pay a fine of 18 billion won (\$17 million). When the wide-ranging corruption scandal broke last vear it prompted massive street protests against Park across the country.

On Friday, the verdict was greeted with public displays of outrage and grief by several hundred Park supporters who had gathered outside the courthouse. Many protesters sat or lay in the road crying, while others formed a protest rally calling for her release. "The rule of law in this country is dead today," said Han Geunhyung, a 27-year-old Park supporter.

Park herself was not in court for Friday's judgment which, in a rare move, was broadcast live on television. She had boycotted most sessions of the trial in protest

at being held in custody. Instead she was informed of her fate at a Seoul detention centre, where she sat in a reception hall with her lawyer awaiting the outcome, Yonhap news agency reported. She now has seven days in which to file an appeal.

Park becomes the third former South Korean leader to be convicted on criminal charges after leaving office, joining Chun Doo-hwan and Roh Tae-woo, who were both found guilty of treason and corruption in the 1990s. Judge Kim said he had passed a tough sentence to "prevent such an unfortunate event from happening again".

The presidential Blue House said in a statement after the verdict: "Each person must have different feelings about former President Park Geun-hye. But a bleak wind

blew through the hearts of all of us today. "It is a heartbreaking event for the nation as well as for the person's life. A history that is not remembered is bound to be repeated. We will not forget today."

A Korean 'Rasputin'? Park, the daughter of dictator Park Chung-hee, lost both her parents to assassins. She took office in 2013 as a conservative

incomprehensible attitude by blaming Choi and other ... icon who cast herself in the role of daughter of the nation-incorruptible and beholden to none. Less than four years later, she was impeached, stripped of all her powers and ousted from office on the back of monthslong mass protests that brought millions on to the streets of Seoul and other cities.

Much of the public anger was focused on Park's relationship with Choi and accusations that she let her friend-who held no formal position or security clearance-meddle in state affairs, including high-level appointments and editing official speeches. Choi is the daughter of a shadowy religious figure who had served as a mentor to Park for decades until his death in 1994. She was tried separately and sentenced in February to 20 years in prison.

presidential ties to squeeze tens of millions of dollars out of major South Korean businesses, including Samsung-the world's top smartphone maker-and retail giant Lotte.

'No remorse'

Former leaders Chun and Roh received presidential pardons after each spent around two years in jail-a privilege that may elude Park for many years, said Jeong Hanwool, an analyst at think tank Hankook Research. "Given her attitude and public anger over her scandal that remains raw, it will be difficult to create a political environment in favour of her release any time soon," Jeong told AFP.

Park's left-leaning successor Moon Jae-in came to power largely because of the public backlash against Park and her conservative party, dimming hopes for a pardon under the current administration, he added. Chun Sang-chin, sociology professor at Seoul's Sogang University, said the verdict could also spell bad news for Park's immediate predecessor Lee Myung-bak, who is in custody as prosecutors investigate multiple corruption charges involving him and his relatives.

"This is a good news for people who took to the street with candles but a nightmare for Lee Myungbak." Chun said. Park's core supporters have always seen her as a heroically tragic figure who devoted her life to the service of her country despite childhood tragedy. But for the vast majority of Koreans, she has now been permanently disowned, and will go down in history not as the country's first woman president but the first democratically elected leader to be forced from office. —AFP



Sentencing as a 'heartbreaking event'

DHAKA: When Ayesha Akhter walks into the factory where she works, the supervisor greets her with a smile and wishes her a pleasant day - a major change after years of physical and verbal abuse from managers in Bangladesh's \$28 billion garment industry. The seamstress said it is her biggest victory since being elected president in October of the workers' union at Jeans Factory Limited in Dhaka, amid a push to improve conditions across the global fashion supply chain.

"In all these years, I have heard supervisors yell, verbally abuse, call us prostitutes and slap us behind our heads to work faster," Akhter, who spends eight hours a day stitching pockets on jeans and shorts, told the Thomson Reuters Foundation. "Then I became the union president and everything changed. Overnight, I became important."

Akhter, 28, is among scores of women in Bangladesh standing up to head unions and negotiate with male-dominated management for more pay, safer workplaces and respect on the job. Bangladesh is the world's second-largest garment exporter with some 4 million people working in its 4,000-plus factories, nearly 80 percent of them women, campaigners say. Poor working conditions and low wages have long been a concern in the sector, which suffered one of the worst industrial accidents in 2013, when more than 1,100 people were killed in the collapse of the Rana Plaza complex. Garment factory workers attempting to set up unions have encountered resistance across the region, with many losing their jobs or being suspended by managements that fear the power of unions, leaders said. "Freedom of association and collective bargaining are the biggest challenges the industry faces today," said Nazma Akter, a former child worker and founder of Awaj Foundation, which campaigns for labour rights. "Without that power, workers are just surviving, not leading normal lives, and it's almost a crime.'

Young, dynamic women

Five years after Rana Plaza, one of the region's strongest movements to organize workers and help them exercise collective bargaining has emerged - led by Bengali women. The number of registered unions in Bangladesh has increased about fivefold to almost 500 since 2013, according to Jennifer Kuhlman of US-based workers' rights charity Solidarity Center. "Many of them are being headed by young, dynamic women who are choosing to lead from the front to bring about change," said Kuhlman, who heads its Bangladesh programs. Campaigners estimate that women make up about half of the new factory union leaders. Although women said their newfound union power had opened their eyes to their rights - from social security benefits to overtime - they fear losing their jobs.

Akhter remembers the "big fight" she had with her husband when she said she was considering standing for president. "He was mad and upset and clearly told me not to," said the mother of two. "He was scared and worried about my safety. He relented but we always worry because of what we see and hear." It was easy to unionize immediately after the Rana Plaza disaster but activists are now being harassed, workers fired and union meetings disrupted, said Babul Akhter, president of the Bangladesh Garment and Industrial Workers Federation. - AFP

to face killer in India

OLD GOA: The mother of an Irish woman raped and murdered in an Indian tourist resort said vesterday she wants to confront the alleged killer face-to-face at his trial which has just started. On the opening day Friday of the trial of tourist guide Vikat Bhagat, a witness told the court the face of Danielle McLaughlin had been mutilated with a bottle to impede identification.

Andrea Brannigan, mother of the 28-year-old who had been on holiday in Goa, was not present but told AFP she would travel to India for future hearings. "I am very nervous for the trial and hope justice is swiftly served for Danielle's sake," Brannigan, 47, said from Ireland in a telephone interview. "I am hopeful the verdict will be out soon because the investigation officials have collected evidence and fast-tracked the entire process, which is amazing."

The family is represented by an Indian lawyer at the trial. But in a rare gesture, Brannigan has been given permission to intervene at the hearing. That means she will be able to confront Bhagat and she said she wants to take the chance. "I want to ask him why he did this," she said. "The way Danielle's case has been handled in Goa has been amazing and I couldn't thank them enough. "I have the right to representation, which is very unusual, but we can ensure the proceedings are (moving) in the right direction."

Brannigan said she still felt "shocked and devastated" at the murder. "I've never had any bad experience in Goa and believe there are good and bad people. Now I just want swift justice for my daughter." The naked and battered body of McLaughlin, who came from Buncrana in Ireland, was discovered in a field near a Goa beach in March last year. Bhagat, 24, was detained the next day

and has been charged with raping and murdering her and destroying evidence.

He has not yet entered a plea. Police said Bhagat initially confessed but he has since written an open letter denying responsibility. McLaughlin was celebrating the Indian spring festival of Holi at Goa's popular Palolem beach. Local farmer Prashant Komarpant told the opening hearing how he found the body, with the face mutilated

and bloody, on March 13 last year. The hearing will resume on April 13. Several foreigners have been murdered in Goa over the past decade, including 15-year-old British schoolgirl Scarlett Keeling. Her semi-naked body was found in shallow water on a beach in 2008. The deaths have blighted the resort state's reputation as a tourist haven. In 2016 two Indian men were cleared of the rape and murder of Keeling. —AFP

In Kenya, **British soldiers** train in huge war games

LOLLDAIGA HILLS: High on Kenya's Laikipia plateau hundreds of British soldiers spent a recent half-moon night fording a river, marching across wadis and over escarpments before attacking a mocked-up army training camp. This is whereand how-British soldiers learn to fight, in regular six-week training sessions culminating in a simulated assault, this time involving 1,000 troops.

"This is among the most demanding training that we do," said Brigadier Nick Perry, commander of Britain's 16 Air Assault Brigade, who was in Kenya with three companies of Gurkhas, a storied regiment made up predominately of Nepalese recruits, with their signature curved kukri knives. The size and scale of the British war games in Kenya is unusual: only Suffield in Canada and England's Salisbury Plain allow something similar

In recent years, infantry units were sent to

Kenya for their final training before being deployed to Afghanistan and, for the "rapid reaction force" 16 Air Assault, being always battle-ready is a point of pride. "I need soldiers to be ready to go on operations at very short notice," said Perry. "Kenya allows large-scale exercises so the whole battle group-the infantry, the artillery, the engineers, the intelligence and surveillance assets-can be tested alongside each other."

They also work alongside the Kenya Defense Forces (KDF), of which a 150-strong company swept across a hillside dotted with acacia and euphorbia trees in one of the final moments of the recent training exercise. "Increasingly, operations around the world are multinational. It's pretty rare now to find a single nation at conflict, and as Britain we're not in that game." Britain hasn't gone to war alone since 1982 when it fought a two-month battle with Argentina over the Falkland Islands. British troops are currently deployed as part of multinational forces in Afghanistan and Iraq and as peacekeepers in South Sudan and Somalia.

A history of (simulated) violence

Battle groups come to Kenya several times a year, training with live fire at Archer's Post in the centre of the country and on private land in Laikipia. British Army Training Unit Kenya



(BATUK) commander Colonel Nick Wood said the British military presence in Kenya is worth around \$57 million (46 million euros) to the local economy

But it also underpins Britain's diplomatic relations with Kenya, a former colonial property where a bitter independence war was fought in the 1950s, yet where British military training has continued with few breaks for over 70 years. "We're very much part of life here," Wood said.

The aim of the training isn't to inflate soldiers' confidence with easy wins, but to push them, sometimes to the point of defeat. "It's a challenging war-fighting mission against an impressive and well-equipped enemy," said Perry, of the assault exercise. It began in a clearing of croton and poison arrow trees where two six by sixmeter (20 x 20-foot) tarpaulins were laid on the ground and marked with map grid references, contour lines, rivers, tracks and buildings. - AFP

Immigration row overshadows start of Merkel's fourth term

BERLIN: A scuffle over immigration has marred the first weeks in office of Chancellor Angela Merkel's fourth coalition, promising anything but smooth sailing in the years ahead for the loveless left-right alliance. Conservatives among Merkel's Christian Democrats are keen to restrict as heavily as possible so-called "family reunifications" that would allow some of the million-plus migrants and refugees who have arrived since 2015 to bring in relatives.

That has stirred the ire of Social Democrats (SPD), the

reluctant junior partners who helped Merkel into office to end the longest period of post-election limbo in post-World War II German history. In their painstakingly-negotiated coalition deal, the parties agreed that up to 1,000 people per month could enter Germany under family reunification, with only immediate relatives eligible. New Interior Minister

Horst Seehofer is eager to tighten the screws further, with a draft law that would prevent people dependent on social benefits from bringing in family members and further restrict which relations are eligible, including ruling out siblings. Many people who arrived in Germany as refugees are yet to join the labor market, undergoing job training or language classes, and would therefore not qualify.

Seehofer is a former leader of the ultra-conservative CSU, the smaller Bavarian sister party of Merkel's more centrist CDU. He is keen to burnish his outfit's anti-immigration credentials ahead of a state election later this year, when they will face a stiff challenge from anti-Islam, anti-immigration party Alternative for Germany (AfD).

"We don't want an influx into the social system. That's also how we've discussed this within the coalition," he told Der Spiegel magazine's Saturdav edition. Two vears ago, Seehofer blasted Merkel's 2015 decision to open

Germany's borders to refugees arriving in Europe via the so-called "Balkan route" from the Middle East, saving it had produced a "rule of injustice" in Europe's most populous nation. Arriving in his Berlin ministry after being ejected from the state premiership in prosperous Bavaria, he lost no time before stirring up controversy with a declaration that "Islam does not belong to Germany", which is home to around four million Muslims.

'Coalition would be over'

Social democrats, already smarting from the concessions made on immigration in the coalition agreement, have bristled at Seehofer's sallies in the media and at the draft law. Justice Minister Heiko Maas declared that "we will not agree to any draft which we consider to be mainly aimed at reducing numbers" allowed to enter Germany. For his part, Seehofer insisted Friday that he was "sticking very, very

closely to the coalition agreement," suggesting cabinet colleagues from the SPD should "relax" about his law.

Meanwhile, his CSU party colleagues have backed him to the hilt. "If the Social Democrats don't cooperate, the 'grand coalition' would be over" less than a month after Merkel was sworn in, deputy leader of the conservative parliamentary group Georg Nuesslein told the Augsburger Allgemeine newspaper. The family reunification row is just one front in a broader battle over immigration, integration and Islam in German society that has pitted the SPD against the CDU/CSU.

Seehofer is also keen to speed up expulsions of people whose asylum applications are refused, many of whom spend months or years contesting the decisions in the courts or acquire a "tolerated" residence status. After weeks of mud-slinging, some among the conservatives are uncomfortable with the relentless focus on such themes.

"The question is: do we really win elections by naming

the topics that stir people up without changing any-thing?" asked Armin Laschet, CDU state premier of North Rhine-Westphalia. Merkel will be counting on the support of moderates like Laschet to contain bubbling discontent on the right of her party.

Health Minister Jens Spahn, a rising star of the CDU's right wing seen as a potential future candidate for the chancellorship, has spent his first weeks in

office giving interviews urging more "law and order" in troubled city districts.

He has also chided feminist pro-abortion campaigners, saying they cared more about animal rights than unborn children, and declared that long-term unemploved people were not poor. A government spokesman said Spahn's statements were his "personal" views, not government policy. -AFP

Hungary's divisive **Orban tipped** for re-election

BUDAPEST: Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban, one of Europe's most controversial leaders, looks set to win a third consecutive term in an election today, despite uncertainty over tactical voting and turnout that could trigger an upset. At a final campaign event on Saturday in the city of Szekesfehervar, southwest of Budapest, Orban urged his supporters to turn out to vote. "It's not enough to be ahead in the polls, we have to come first on voting day too," he said, recalling his party's loss in a 2002 election despite having been considered the favourites beforehand. The strongman nationalist's Fidesz party enjoys opinion poll leads of between 20 and 30 percentage points over its closest rival Jobbik, a far-right party led by Gabor Vona that has been moving towards the centre, and the leftist Socialists with their candidate Gergely Karacsony. The first results are expected to emerge one or two hours after polls close at 1700 GMT today, with broader trends only emerging slowly over the course of the evening. "Rational logic suggests Fidesz will win, but there is something in the air that points toward a surprise," analyst Gabor Torok said Friday.

Immigration fears

A mainly first-past-the-post election system designed by Fidesz after it came to power gives it an advantage over the fragmented opposition parties. But a recent mayoral by-election saw Fidesz suffer a shock defeat after the opposition united behind a single independent candidate, sparking a surge in turnout. Analysts say nationwide turnout of over 70 percent would put Fidesz's majority in danger.

Since the by-election, civil society groups have urged nationwide tactical voting today to foil Fidesz in electoral districts, although the opposition parties have failed to present a united front. Despite being on course for overall victory, analysts say Fidesz is likely to fall short of a third consecutive two-thirds "supermajority" in the 199-seat assembly that has allowed it to railroad through controversial bills.

Although the economy has picked up in recent years and wages are steadily rising, Orban's campaign has focused on warnings about mass immigration by Muslims and Africans. Fears over immigration are entrenched in Hungary after some 400,000 refugees and migrants traversed the EU member in 2015, prompting Orban to erect SZEKESFEHERVAR: Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orban delivers his speech during the last campaign event of his Fidesz party. —AFP

a border fence that is popular with voters. Casting himself as a defender of national sovereignty and "Christian Europe" against the "globalist elite", Orban has spearheaded divisions between the European Union's western and eastern members like Hungary and Poland. On a visit to Budapest Friday, Jaroslaw Kaczynski, leader of Poland's governing PiS party, endorsed Orban for today's vote.

"Today the freedom, sovereignty and dignity of nations, for you and for us Poles, is tied to Viktor Orban," he said. The 54-year-old Orban's anti-immigration stance and verbal onslaughts against "meddling Brussels bureaucrats" have gained him admirers not just in nearby Poland but also among ultra-nationalists in western Europe and beyond. But Brussels has sued Budapest over its resistance to the bloc's refugee resettlement plan, as well as laws targeting civil society groups and a university linked to the beral US billionaire George Soros.

'Hungary is first!'

The so-called "nuclear" step of launching "Article 7" sanctions over Hungary's alleged breaches of EU values, a penalty so far only applied to Poland, has been raised and could lead to the suspension of Hungary's European Parliament voting rights. But a strong majority on Sunday would cement Orban's plan, declared in 2014, to mould ex-communist Hungary (population 9.8 million) into an "illiberal" state modelled on countries like Russia and Turkey.

During a bruising election campaign Orban has stepped up his long-running attacks on the Hungarian-born Soros which have included media blitzes called xenophobic and anti-Semitic by critics. Fidesz posters show the slogan "For us, Hungary is first!" and the 87-year-old Jewish financier standing with opposition leaders, brandishing wirecutters to take down the border fences. Orban himself has shunned debate with rivals and questions from the independent media, and appeared in public only at carefully choreographed events. His aura of invincibility has however been shaken by a wave of corruption scandals involving close allies and family members that have intensified in recent weeks and heightened unpredictability about today's result. —AFP

Provincial governor Lutfullah Azizi confirmed Hekmat had been killed but said US Forces carried out the airstrike. US Forces did not immediately respond to AFP's request for comment. "Our intelligence sources have identified his body. His death will affect the recruitment of Daesh and disperse IS fighters in Afghanistan's north," Azizi said, using the Arabic acronym for IS.

Afghan and US forces have ramped up airstrikes and ground offensives against IS fighters in Jowzjan in recent months as the group seeks to expand its foothold in the country. Afghan security forces last month detained a French woman fighting for IS in the same district of Jowzjan. AFP has reported that French and Algerian fighters, some arriving from Syria, have joined IS in the restive province. In January, Afghan forces caught the group's "head facilitator of foreign forces". Two months later, his two successors were killed in a US airstrike, NATO's Resolute Support mission said previously. ---AFP

India defense website 'hacked'

NEW DELHI: India's defense minister said the department website was hacked on Friday, with the web portals of at least three other government departments including the interior, law and labor ministries also appearing to be down. Defense Minister Nirmala Sitharaman confirmed the attack, but India's cyber security czar denied hacking had taken place, saying a "hardware problem" was to blame. "Action is initiated after the hacking of the MoD (ministry of defense) website. The website shall be restored shortly,' Sitharaman said on Twitter. "Needless to say, every possible step required to prevent any such eventuality in the future will be taken," she added. The defense ministry website was the first to be affected, with its homepage replaced by a screen showing a Chinese character that means "zen". Soon, other major departments' websites were either "unreachable" or "not found". The Ministry of Home Affairs website's main page said that the site was offline "due to technical problems". - AFP

Michigan says water crisis over

FLINT: The state of Michigan will no longer supply free bottled water to Flint, the city that was plagued with leadtainted drinking water in a crisis that drew national attention, officials said on Friday. For nearly two years, tests have shown that Flint's water is the same or better than similar cities across the state, a statement from Michigan Governor Rick Snyder's office said. When the current supply of state-funded bottled water is depleted, the four remaining distribution centers will close and deliveries will end. "The scientific data now proves the water system is stable and the need for bottled water has ended," the Republican governor said in the statement. "Since Flint's water is now well within the standards set by the federal government, we will now focus even more of our efforts on continuing with the health, education and economic development assistance needed to help move Flint forward." Officials from the city of Flint did not immediately respond to requests for comment. -Reuters

Jihadists killed in Mali

BAMAKO: Fourteen suspected jihadists were killed on Friday during an "alleged escape attempt", a day after they were taken in for questioning, the Malian army said in a statement. However, two local officials told AFP that 20 civilians had been killed or arrested in Dioura, central Mali, and cast doubt on the prison escape story. On Tuesday Amnesty International called on authorities in Mali to investigate extrajudicial killings following the discovery last week of a mass grave containing six bodies. Once a beacon of democracy and stability in Africa, Mali has been undermined by a coup, civil war and Islamist terrorism. Extremists linked to Al-Qaeda took control of Mali's desert north in early 2012, but were largely driven out in a Frenchled military operation launched in January 2013. In June 2015, Mali's government signed a peace agreement with some armed groups, but the jihadists remain active, and large tracts of the country remain lawless. -AFP

Turkey: 108 Kurd militants 'neutralized'

ANKARA: Some 108 Kurdish militants have been "neutralized" in operations targeting southeast Turkey and northern Iraq over the past week, Turkey's armed forces said yesterday. The military uses the term "neutralized" to refer to operations in which opposition forces have been killed, wounded or captured. In a weekly roundup, it said it had neutralized 31 militants from the outlawed Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) in the southeastern provinces of Tunceli, Mardin, Diyarbakir and Sirnak. It said 77 other militants had been neutralized in cross-border operations. Earlier yesterday, the military said it had neutralized six militants in an air strike

targeting northern Iraq's Hakurk region. Turkey regularly carries out air strikes against PKK targets in northern Iraq, where the group is based in the Qandil Mountains, but has also recently threatened to push its operations to Sinjar. Ankara has long complained that PKK fighters are being given free rein to operate out of Sinjar against Turkish targets.

President Tayyip Erdogan said Turkey would do "what is necessary" if an Iraqi operation against the militants failed, raising the prospect of a possible direct Turkish military operation. Turkish forces are currently waging a full-scale military operation in the Afrin region of northern Syria against the Syrian Kurdish YPG militia, which Ankara sees as an extension of the PKK.

The PKK, considered a terrorist organization by Turkey, the United States and the European Union, has waged a threedecade insurgency in Turkey's largely Kurdish southeast that has killed some 40,000 people. — Reuters

Top IS commander killed in airstrike


MAZAR-I-SHARIF: A high-ranking Islamic State commander in Afghanistan has been killed in an airstrike, officials said vesterday, as Afghan and US forces dial up attacks on the militant group. Qari Hekmat was the top commander of IS's Afghan franchise in the northern province of Jowzjan, where the group established a stronghold after coming under intense pressure in the eastern province of Nangarhar.

Hekmat was killed Friday in an Afghan airstrike in Darzab district, the defense ministry said in a statement, describing him as "one of the key figures" for IS in northern Afghanistan. He was involved in or responsible for "deadly terrorist attacks" and has

The MLK Jr we should remember

n April 4th, we commemorated the anniversary of the assasnation of Reverend Dr Martin Luther King Jr. Although it's been 50 years since that terrible day, like many in my generation I will never forget the horror we felt, the profound sense of loss we experienced, and the feeling that we were standing at the edge of an abyss. What followed in the days and months ahead, tragically validated our deepest fears. Rioting broke out in over 100 American cities, as traumatized African Americans rose up in shock and anger at the slaving of their beloved leader.

A few months later, Senator Robert F Kennedy was also assassinated. And a few months after that, with Democrats meeting in Chicago at their presidential nominating convention, Chicago police and national guard units violently confronted a massive anti-Vietnam War protest that had gathered at the convention. As delegates inside the convention hall expressed their solidarity with the protesters, they were also met with violence. It was a troubled time as issues of an unjust war, racism, and deep economic disparities that saw millions of Americans, black and white, locked in poverty, all came to the forefront. King stood at the center of the national debate on all these issues and precisely for that reason, he was reviled and hated by those whose interests he threatened.

There were some, especially northern liberals, who accepted King's challenge to the "Jim Crow" laws in the south that had for generations enforced a system of racial segregation. But when he turned his attention to the no less odious segregation that defined black life northern cities, these same liberals balked in protest. And when King spoke out against the war in Vietnam, organized the Poor Peoples' Campaign, and began to organize support for workers on strike for a living wage, they decidedly turned against him. They had loved his "I have a dream" speech because it didn't threaten them. But when he expanded his dream to challenge poverty, war, and social injustice and began to translate it into action, he was rejected and scorned. What is so disturbing is how the King we have come to remember today is not the King who lived and worked among us, but a hollowed out, whitewashed, acceptable shadow of the man who challenges no one. As my friend and mentor, Jesse jackson, wrote recently, "we owe it to King - and to our children and grandchildren - to commemorate the man in full: a radical, ecumenical, antiwar, pro-immigrant, and scholarly champion of the poor who spent much more time marching and going to jail for liberation and justice than he ever spent dreaming about it". With Jackson's words in mind, I want to honor the memory of this remarkable visionary by letting King's own prophetic words define his legacy.



Thinking behind Trump approach to China

Then Liu He, Chinese President Xi Jinping's top economic adviser, came to Washington in late February, he was expected to make arrangements for restarting trade talks that President Donald Trump had put on ice. But just as Liu arrived, the Trump administration announced global steel and aluminum tariffs aimed at punishing China for what Washington says is its overproduction of steel that hurts US steel makers. The announcement came a day ahead of a meeting planned with Trump's economic point men, Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin and then White House adviser Gary Cohn.

Pessimistic Trump officials had said the Liu meeting would probably go nowhere. "People expect that whatever the Chinese offer it will be insufficient," a White House official told Reuters just hours ahead of the meeting. The timing of the announcement, whether deliberately aimed at embarrassing Liu or not, was emblematic

theme in his 2016 election campaign. With Cohn and other moderating voices now gone from his administration, White House officials say he now feels more able to keep his campaign promises. Trump's negotiating style, honed in his years as a real estate developer, is to take extreme positions to force concessions from his opponents. So far that approach has had mixed results at home and abroad.

'We can't just trust'

While the Trump administration has signaled it is open to negotiating with China to avoid a trade war, it is no mood for talks that produce vague promises but no verifiable results. "We can't just trust. We need to verify and we need to make sure that if we do get into a negotiation situation where China is making commitments, they have to be commitments that we know that they're going to

Friday called the punitive steps by the United States as "extremely mistaken," threatened a "fierce counter strike" and said no negotiations were likely in the current circumstances. While Beijing claims that Washington is the aggressor and is spurring global protectionism, China's trading partners have complained for years that it abuses World Trade Organization rules and propagates unfair policies at home that lock foreign firms out of some sectors as domestic champions are being nurtured.

'Spiraling downwards'

Along with Navarro, Lighthizer, the US Trade Representative, is also pushing for a more combative approach to toward China. A veteran trade lawyer who built dozens of steel industry anti-dumping cases against Chinese producers, he has been plotting a trade confrontation with China for years. In 2010, he argued in testimony before a congressional commission that

On our shared humanity and interdependence

"An individual has not started living until he can rise above the narrow confines of his individualistic concerns to embrace the broader concerns of all humanity". "All men are interdependent. Every nation is an heir of a vast treasury of ideas and labor to which both the living and dead of all nations have contributed. On the moral challenges that we face

"The ultimate measure of a man is not where he stands in moments of comfort and convenience, but where he stands at times of challenge and controversy. The true neighbor will risk his position, his prestige, and even his life for the welfare of others." "I have the audacity to believe that people everywhere can have three meals a day for their bodies, education and culture for their minds, and dignity, equality, and freedom for their spirits."

On the fight against racism

"White America must see that no other ethnic group has been a slave on American soil. That is one thing that other immigrant groups hadn't had to face...America freed the slaves in 1863...but gave the slaves no land or nothing in reality to get started on. At the same time, America gave away millions of acres of land in the Midwest and the West. Which meant that there was a willingness to give the white peasants of Europe an economic base. And yet it refused to give an economic to its black peasants from Africa who came here involuntarily, in chains, and who had worked for free for 244 years...And so emancipation for the Negro was really freedom to hunger...it was freedom without food to eat or land to cultivate." "To develop a sense of black consciousness and peoplehood does not require that we scorn the white race...it is not the race per se that we fight but the policies and ideologies that leaders of that race have formulated to perpetuate oppression."

On the struggle for justice

"Freedom is never voluntarily given by the oppressor; it must be demanded by the oppressed." "True peace is not merely the absence of tension; it is the presence of justice.'

On his opposition to war

"As I have walked among the desperate, rejected, and angry young men, I have told them that Molotov cocktails and rifles will not solve their problems. I have tried to offer them my deepest compassion while maintaining my conviction that social change comes most meaningfully through nonviolent action. But they asked, and rightly so, 'What about Vietnam?' They asked if our own nation wasn't using massive doses of violence to solve its problems to bring about the changes it wanted. Their questions hit home and I knew I could never again raise my voice against the violence of the oppressed in the ghettos without first having spoken clearly to the greatest purveyor of violence in the world today: my own government. For the sake of those boys, for the sake of this government, for the sake of the hundreds of thousands trembling under our violence, I cannot be silent."

of the Trump administration's more confrontational approach to what the United States has long viewed as China's unfair trade practices.

It was the opening salvo in a pattern of escalation that continued last week as Trump slapped first \$50 billion in tariffs on China and then said he would seek \$100 billion more after Beijing struck back. The rapid tit-for-tat escalation, which has brought the world's two biggest economies to the edge of a trade war, is being driven by anti-China economist Peter Navarro and U.S trade negotiator Robert Lighthizer, who cut his teeth in trade deals with Japan in the 1980s.

Navarro has moved from the sidelines to center stage following the departure of Trump's economic adviser Cohn, who quit in protest over the punitive steel tariffs on China. While Cohn shared Navarro's view that China's unfair trade practices must end, he had instead advocated enlisting help from Europe and Japan to pressure Beijing, sources said. Cohn failed to persuade Trump to that point of view. One White House official said that Navarro is now the dominant voice in the room on China trade. "Once they (Navarro and Lighthizer) get his (Trump's) ear, it's hard to walk him back to a more reasonable place," said one person close to the White House.

Trump does not need much convincing. He has long criticized China's trade practices and it was a recurrent

Southeast Asia's idyllic islands buckle under tourism strain

The six-month closure of the Philippine tourism island of Boracay for a revamp after the country's president branded it a "cesspool" reflects the growing pressures on beach resorts across Southeast Asia as visitor numbers surge. Tourism experts say the region's infrastructure is buckling under record visitor numbers, especially as more Chinese holiday abroad, and expect more drastic measures to come. Airports have become chaotic, hotels are being thrown up hastily with little regard for safety and sanitation, tropical beaches are strewn with garbage and coral reefs are dying.

Thailand already has plans to shut its famous Maya Bay in the Phi Phi islands for four months this summer, while an environmental group is calling for urgent government action to tackle a "crisis" on the Indonesian tourist island of Bali. "Many out-of-control destinations across Asia will need clean-ups," said Brian King, associate dean of the School of Hotel and Tourism Management at Hong Kong Polytechnic University. "These may come from government, or industry or from NGO-driven community action. The danger is that little happens until the crisis point is reached." He added: "Boracay is not the first and won't be the last closure."

Airlines have already started to cut back flights to Boracay, which had 2 million visitors last year, with the largest foreign contingents coming from China and South Korea, ahead of its closure on April 26. The Philippines, which had record visitor numbers last year after three years of double-digit growth, estimates the

US trade officials now largely echo Trump's view that as the importer, the United States holds the whip hand in any talks, citing Chinese exports to the US of \$500 billion a year versus American exports to China of just \$130 billion. With tempers running hot on both sides, there is little imminent prospect of getting Washington and Beijing to the negotiating table.

China's Commerce Ministry spokesman, Gao Feng, on

Boracay closure could reduce full-year GDP by 0.1 percent. It is also planning to inspect the beach resort of Puerto Galera, on the island of Mindoro, and is already looking at the resorts of El Nido and Coron, in Palawan province, where an influx of tourism and rapid development has put infrastructure under strain.

But rival tourist hotspots around the region are not all rubbing their hands at the prospect of the extra revenue from the redirected tourist traffic. Kanokkittika Kritwutikon, the head of the Tourism Authority of Thailand's Phuket office, said the island was at "stretching point", particularly its airport, which has undergone a number of upgrades in recent years to try to cope with overcapacity. "Our policy is to try to spread tourism around" from Phuket to "secondary destinations that are less well-known," said Kanokkittika. "Apart from guests arriving by plane to Phuket we also have boats coming in, including cruises, so you can imagine how many tourists come through Phuket."

The shutdown of Maya Bay in an attempt to salvage the area's coral reefs - which have been damaged by crowds of tourists and warmer temperatures - follows the closure of 10 popular Thai diving sites in 2016 after a National Parks survey found bleaching on up to 80 percent of some reefs. Pattaya, south of Bangkok, serves as another cautionary tale. An influx of western tourists from as far back as the 1960s, when American soldiers came on leave from the Vietnam war, and a construction boom in the 1990s transformed it from a picturesque fishing village to a town known for its seedy nightlife and high crime rate. Thailand's tourism ministry expects 37.55 million tourists this year, up from a record 35 million in 2017, of which 9.8 million were from China.

Shutdowns 'too late'

Benjamin Cassim, a tourism lecturer at Temasek Polytechnic School of Business in Singapore, said the closures of Boracay and Maya Beach could become

some WTO rules may need to be ignored to "force change" in China's practices. "Wringing our hands and hoping for the best is not the answer. We need strong leaders who are prepared to make tough decisions, and who will not be satisfied until this crisis has been resolved," he said at the time.

Lighthizer has adopted a similarly tough stance in talks to renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement, one of the world's biggest trade pacts that spans the United States, Canada and Mexico. He has relentlessly pushed for tough concessions. But in six months of talks, little or no progress has been made. Mexico and Canada have blamed Lighthizer's hardline negotiating stance for the lack of progress. They say he has repeatedly told them to swallow tough concessions on autos, investor protection and other issues. Lighthizer has said he is determined to "rebalance" NAFTA trade to restore lost US manufacturing jobs.

The worry is that these negotiating tactics may not work with China, now the world's second largest economy and one that is not as easy for Washington to sway as its neighbors and longstanding NAFTA allies. "The relationship is spiraling downwards, and the risk of a miscalculation or accident is only increasing," the Council on Foreign Relations Asia studies director Elizabeth Economy wrote. —Reuters

"test cases" and will be closely monitored by other countries with popular beach resorts. A non-profit group in Indonesia has been calling on the government to tackle what it calls an "environmental crisis" in Bali, the country's most popular tourist island, which saw more than 5.5 million visitors last year.

Indonesian authorities have long faced criticism for allowing unplanned developments that have swallowed up rice fields with golf courses and villas on Bali. Its beaches are regularly strewn with plastic washed up from the ocean during certain months of the year. Nonetheless, President Joko Widodo has been trying to promote creation of 10 "new Balis" in other parts of the scenic Indonesian archipelago. "Environmental conditions in Bali are now increasingly degraded," said I Made Juli Untung Pratama of WALHI, the Indonesian Forum for Environment. "The culprit is the construction of massive tourism accommodation, without a proper regard to Bali's environment. The massive development of tourism accommodation has caused the environmental crisis in Bali.'

Shutdowns such as the one on Boracay are not a new phenomenon. Back in 2004, Malaysian authorities shut all hotels on the island of Sipadan, known for having some of the best scuba diving in the world, to help protect its eco-system and subsequently restricted tourist numbers to the island. But some say these extreme actions often come too late, and a more sustainable solution is needed across the region. "Proactive environmental protection is a far more effective approach than reactive environmental protection," said Matt Gebbie, an analyst from Horwath HTL Indonesia, a tourism consultancy. "You can't revive coral reefs and eroded beaches and degraded forests in six months," Gebbie said. "Proactive protection is essential for the long term sustainability of resort destinations." --- Reuters

There were a "high volume of incoming trauma cases" at Royal University Hospital and St Paul's Hospital, the Saskatchewan Health Authority said on Twitter. Both hospitals are located in Saskatoon city, about 250 km from the crash site. Victims' families were directed to Nipawin Apostolic Church for information and support. The Saskatoon Star Phoenix newspaper published on its website a photo of one player who survived, Derek Patter, lying side by side with two other injured players on hospital beds, clasping each other's hands in support. One of the young men appeared to be wearing a neck brace.

"I cannot imagine what these parents are going through, and my heart goes out to everyone affected by this terrible tragedy, in the Humboldt community and beyond," Prime Minister Justin Trudeau tweeted. US President Donald Trump said he called Trudeau "to pay my highest respect and condolences to the families of the terrible Humboldt Team tragedy".

Among those killed on Friday was Yasser Murtaja, 30, a photographer with the Gaza-based Ain Media agency, who died from his wounds after being shot, the health ministry said. Murtaja's company confirmed his death, with witnesses saying he was close to the front of the protests in southern Gaza when he was hit. An AFP picture taken after he was wounded showed Murtaja wearing a press vest as he received treatment. His brother Mutasim, also a journalist, said he was next to him when he was shot. "The target was very clearly journalists," he said. "Yasser went forward to take the true pictures to show the world," he told AFP. "Then the bullet hit him in his stomach."

Israel's army said it "does not intentionally target journalists". "The circumstances in which journalists were allegedly hit by Israeli Defense Force (IDF) fire are not familiar to the IDF, and are being looked into," it said in a statement. Murtaja's body was taken from the hospital to his home in Gaza City yesterday morning, with dozens of journalists following, many fighting back tears. It was wrapped in a Palestinian flag, with a press flak jacket placed on his stomach. Ismail Haniya, the head of Gaza's Islamist rulers Hamas, attended the funeral and said that journalists were attacked by Israel while trying to show a "true picture of a blockaded, downtrodden people".

In the West Bank political capital of Ramallah, around 50 Palestinian journalists held a vigil for Murtaja. Christophe Deloire, secretary general of watchdog Reporters Without Borders (RSF), said Murtaja was "obviously the victim of an intentional shot" and that his organization "condemns with indignation the deliberate shootings of the Israeli army against journalists". Deloire urged an independent investigation of the incident. The Foreign Press Association operating in Israel and the Palestinian territories urged the Israeli army "to show restraint in areas where journalists are operating and to conduct a fast and open investigation into this incident". The Palestinian Journalists' Syndicate said five other reporters were also shot and wounded by the Israeli army during Friday's protests, despite wearing clothes clearly identifying them as journalists. A group of over 70 international NGOs operating in the occupied Palestinian territories meanwhile condemned Friday's "unlawful killing of civilians in Gaza", calling for "an independent and transparent investigation".

"Our Broncos family is in shock as we try to come to grips with our incredible loss," Broncos team president Kevin Garinger said in a statement. The team comprises 24 players, all from Canada, with the youngest aged 16 and the oldest 21. In a statement, Hockey Canada said it was "devastated" by the news. "Our hockey community is a tight-knit family. Protesters on Friday said economic woes were also fuelling frustration in Gaza, which has been under an Israeli blockade for a decade. Egypt has mostly closed its border with the territory in past years, leaving the cramped area of two million people largely sealed off.

Late Friday, Kuwait called on the UN Security Council to investigate the deaths, but the US is likely to veto such a probe. The Security Council also failed to approve Kuwait's draft press statement on the Israeli use of brutal force against innocent Palestinians in the Gaza Strip, the second statement of its kind. Before submitting the document, the permanent representative of Kuwait to the UN Ambassador Mansour Al-Otaibi hoped that no member country would object to the new statement, but the US did.

Thousands of Arabs rallied in northern Israel yesterday in solidarity with the people of Gaza, some of them holding pictures of Murtaja. And in London, hundreds gathered in support of the Palestinians in Gaza, condemning the firing of "live ammunition into crowds of unarmed civilians" by Israeli forces as "illegal and inhumane".

Israel rebuffed international calls for investigation to last Friday's killings, with the army saving troops opened fire "in accordance with the rules of engagement". Late Friday, Israeli army spokesman Brigadier General Ronen Manelis classified the operation along the border as a success. "None of our troops were wounded, the fence was not crossed," he said, noting that what happened last week had "deterred Hamas, which prevented the masses from approaching the fence" Israeli Defense Minister Avigdor Lieberman yesterday accused Hamas of "sending terrorists under the guise of civilians to harm our sovereignty". Israel accuses Hamas, with whom it has fought three wars since 2008, of using the protests as a cover to carry out violence. It alleges more than half of those killed on March 30 were members of militant groups, including Hamas's armed wing. Hamas claimed only five of the dead and said they were participating "in popular events side-by-side with their people." — Agencies

"While Salman Khan gets to go back home to his movie star life for now, black bucks were made to pay the highest price, with their lives," Manilal Valliyate, chief executive

This is the fourth time the 28-year-old McIlroy has arrived at Augusta National with a chance to complete his collection of major trophies. McIlroy has come close before in the Masters, taking a four-shot lead into the final round in 2011 but carding an agonizing final-round 80.-AFP

KARACHI: Pakistan's cricket chiefs hope the country can host a full series by 2020, after a successful tour by the West Indies sparked hopes of an international revival. The three-match series against the World Twenty20 champions, staged in the once militancywracked port city of Karachi, was accompanied by a wave of optimism, with enthusiastic fans braving heavy security checks to express their gratitude to the West Indies for the visit which ended Tuesday.

Last month Karachi also hosted the final of the popular Pakistan Super League, the biggest cricket event in the city since a 2009 attack on the visiting Sri Lankan team in Lahore drove international cricket from the country. Pakistan was forced to host its international fixtures in the United Arab Emirates. But with security dramatically improving in the last three years, the Pakistan Cricket Board has been taking 'gradual steps" to bring them back, PCB chairman Najam Sethi said.

"They are bearing positive results," he told AFP. "We will host more PSL matches next year and by that time almost all the top international players from top cricketing nations will have played in Pakistan," he predicted.

That led to a visit by a World XI side, then the emotional return by the Sri Lankan team in October last year, a hugely symbolic event that also saw Pakistanis turn out in their thousands to welcome the visitors with open arms.

Sammy-a Pakistani crowd favourite-returned for two PSL play-offs in Lahore and the final in Karachi this year, and his presence influenced former teammates Andre Fletcher, Samuel Badree and Chadwick Walton to be part of the West Indies team.

Security remained an enormous issue, however, with massive, head-of-state level arrangements made for each visit. A security company appointed by the International Cricket Council (ICC) under its Pakistan Task Team had greenlit the matches.

"We realised that matches caused inconvenience for Lahorites and Karachiites, but they were a big gain for Pakistan," Sethi said. Now the PCB is setting its sights on bigger teams, with hopes that sides such as South Africa could tour by next year. Pakistan's Interior Minister has also invited the England team to come.

Former Pakistan captain-turned-commentator Ramiz Raja praised the efforts in a newspaper column recently. Pakistan, he wrote, "will fight tooth and nail to bring international cricket back home". - AFP

The wait is finally over as the Indian Premier League (IPL), the world's most prestigious and cash rich Twenty20 tournament, is back again with its 11th edition. Big names from around the world will come together for almost two months, from April 7 to May 27, and matches will be played at nine venues across India. A total of 578 players were up for auction. Right from its inception, the league has been a destination where talent meets opportunity and it was once again evident as out of 113 Indian cricketers that were bought, 71 are uncapped and will get a chance to unleash their potential in the upcoming edition.

This edition will see the return of the Chennai Super Kings and Rajasthan Royals after serving two-year suspensions in an IPL betting case. Rajasthan Royals replaced Australia's Steve Smith as captain over his role in a ball-tampering controversy. Ajinkya Rahane will take over as skipper for the IPL season and South Africa's Heinrich Klaasen will replace Steve Smith. England's Alex Hales will replace David Warner in the Sunrisers Hyderabad squad.

England's star all-rounder Ben Stokes topped the Indian Premier League auction, selling for \$1.96 million despite a looming court case for assault. Eight IPL teams spent over \$50m on talent. Stokes's deal with Rajasthan Royals came ahead of Indian batsmen Lokesh Rahul, Manish Pandey and Jayadev Unadkat and Australians Chris Lynn and Glenn Maxwell in the top prices paid. Australian fast bowler Mitchell Starc will also miss the IPL's eleventh edition due to an injury to his right leg. The injury comes as big blow to KKR as Starc would have added some serious teeth to their bowling attack.

Delhi Daredevils, Kings XI Punjab and Rajasthan Royals have fantastic squads. Kings XI Punjab have a strong batting lineup with star players. Then you have the powerhouses of IPL, defending champions Mumbai Indians, who have perfect combination of batsmen and bowlers, and the most popular team of IPL - the Chennai Super Kings. Chennai Super Kings have the largest fan base in India compared to all the other teams and both these teams know how to win the IPL 2018 trophy.

Sunrisers Hyderabad will be jolted with a big blow with the ban on Warner. Delhi Daredevils are also in the run-up for the title and may come out as champions, as captain Gautam Gambir's comeback will be a big boost to the team. They have an excellent batting line-up and good fast bowlers.

As the IPL season steps into its 11th chapter, it's probably stronger than ever. IPL also gets a new home this season after Star India Pvt Ltd successfully pipped Sony Pictures Network to bag both TV and digital rights from 2018 to 2022 for a whopping global bid. We look forward to see eight strong franchise teams with eight leaders with exciting finishes as the tournament enters a new decade.

Phelps-like le Clos, Peaty light up Commonwealths

India extend their weightlifting haul to six medals

GOLD COAST: Chad le Clos made history and Adam Peaty completed a four-year unbeaten cycle as two of the Commonwealth Games' top swimmers lit up the Gold Coast yesterday. Le Clos's 200 metres butterfly victory made him the first man to win the same event three times at the Games, while Peaty extended his remarkable 100m breaststroke winning streak.

It came on a day when Australia won two more swimming golds and another two in track cycling to reach 20 at the top of the medals table, ahead of England on 14. Le Clos grabbed his second gold of these Games and sixth overall with victory in the 200m fly, his pet event, in which he famously stunned Michael Phelps at the 2012 Olympics.

Although two women, Australia's Leisel Jones and Petria Thomas, have won the three golds in the same event, le Clos becomes the first male swimmer to complete a hat-trick. "I wanted to get the three — 2014, 2016, 2018. No one has done the triple before so I feel like the Michael Phelps of the Commonwealth (Games) — I'm happy."

World record-holder Peaty, however, was less satisfied with his 100m breaststroke, despite extending an unbeaten run which dates back to his Commonwealth victory in 2014. "I think I was on world-record pace at 50m but I was cramping up with 50 to go and that never happens," said Peaty, 23.

"It's been a big learning curve here. My stroke feels nowhere near where it should be. I think we've got to go back to the drawing board." Australia's Cate Campbell won the women's 50m freestyle for her second gold of the Games, and Ariarne Titmus anchored the hosts to victory in the 4x200m freestyle.

HEAVY CRASH

At Anna Meares Velodrome, Australian cyclist Sam Welsford won the men's 15km scratch race and Kaarle McCulloch triumphed in the women's 500m time trial — but world champion Matthew Glaetzer was stunned in the sprint. England's Nile Wilson gritted his teeth through a wrist injury to win the all-around gymnastics, pipping team-mate James Hall on the final apparatus, the high bar.

PHILADELPHIA: Ben Simmons recorded his 12th triple-double of the season with 27 points, 15 rebounds and 13 assists to lead Philadelphia past visiting Cleveland even as LeBron James posted his 18th triple-double of the season. JJ Redick scored 28 points, Marco Belinelli contributed 23 and Ersan Ilyasova had 17 for the surging Sixers (49-30), who won their 13th straight game for the first time since the 1984-85 season. The Sixers also moved past the Cavaliers and into the No. 3 spot in the Eastern Conference playoff standings with one game at hand. Cleveland has two games remaining, while Philadelphia has three. Robert Covington added 11 points and Markelle Fultz had 10 for Philadelphia. James ended with 44 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists, though he committed eight turnovers. Jeff Green scored 33 points and Kevin Love added 17 for Cleveland.

Aussie cyclist back from brink for emotional Games glory

BRISBANE: Four years ago Australian cyclist Kaarle McCulloch missed the Commonwealth Games with a chronic injury that reduced her to tears, gobbled up her life savings and brought her to the brink of quitting Yesterday, she won the 500m time trial in front of an ecstatic home crowd for her third-and most satisfyingmedal at the Games on the Gold Coast. The 30-year-old trumped fellow Australian Stephanie Morton, who took silver, with Emma Cumming of New Zealand grabbing bronze. It was a deeply personal triumph for McCulloch, who paraded around the track afterwards taking the acclaim of a capacity 4,000 crowd at the Anna Meares Velodrome, pumping her fists and blowing kisses. McCulloch, for whom this was the biggest victory of her turbulent career, described how the pain she had been feeling in a knee for years suddenly exploded as she was on the track in January 2014. "I did the warm-up and just came back off the track and burst into tears. I was sick of riding in pain, for five years I was getting on the bike and being in pain," she said, after adding gold to the team sprint title and a bronze in the women's sprint. "I said to my coach at the time, 'This is it, I can't do this anymore." She had chronic pain in a knee, but the problem was actually linked to her back and she took three months off, never getting on a bike and ruminating over her future, before her coach convinced her to carry on. "I did rehab and got back on the bike and suddenly I was training without pain," said McCulloch, who had tears welling in her eyes as she stood atop the podium, the Australian national anthem ringing out and her gold

Minnesota (45-35) moved into sole possession of the eighth and final Western Conference playoff spot by a half-game over the idle Denver Nuggets. Josh Hart had 20 points and 11 rebounds and Julius Randle added 20 points and 10 rebounds for the Lakers, who lost for the fourth time in the past five games. Brook Lopez scored 18 points, and Ivica Zubac had 14 points and nine rebounds.

CELTICS 111, BULLS 104

One day after learning Kyrie Irving would need a second left knee procedure and miss the rest of the year, Boston claimed its seventh victory in nine games, beating visiting Chicago. Jaylen Brown scored a career-high 32 points, including a career-best seven 3-pointers, and Greg Monroe had a triple-double with 19 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists to pace Boston. It was Monroe's second career triple-double and his first since Nov. 7, 2012, with the Detroit Pistons. "I believe in the guys in our locker room," Celtics coach Brad Stevens told reporters when asked about his team's chances in the playoffs without Irving. "I think they believe in themselves, and I think that's the most important thing."

RAPTORS 92, PACERS 73

Serge Ibaka scored 25 points on 10-of-13 shooting as Toronto clinched the No. 1 seed in the East with a rout of visiting Indiana as the Raptors held the Pacers to season lows in points and shooting (29.9 percent). DeMar DeRozan added 12 points for the Raptors, who shot 42.9 percent. Jonas Valanciunas contributed eight points and a team-high 12 rebounds. The Raptors, who won the season series 3-1, set a franchise record with their 57th victory, passing the 2015-16 team. The Pacers appear likely to finish in the No. 5 spot, as they sit two games back of No. 4 Cleveland and four games clear of No. 6 Miami.—Reuters

'I WANT TO BE THERE'

McCulloch described how she spent 30,000 Australian dollars (US\$23,000) on her rehabilitation-"I used up all of my life savings"-after losing her scholarship with Cycling Australia. "I just thought to myself, 'You know what? You just need to keep going until you feel like that's it." I was sitting in the stands in Rio and even though I didn't get to race, I was sitting there thinking: I should be there, I want to be there. "And it just motivated me and I've stuck with it. "Sitting at home watching the guys at the 2014 Commonwealth Games hurt a lot, but tonight has made up for all of it."

McCulloch's was a sixth Games cycling gold for the hosts, resurgent after a disastrous Olympics, and Sam Welsford quickly won number seven in the 15km scratch race. — AFP

Unfancied Malaysian stuns cycling world champion

BRISBANE: Cycling sprint world champion Matt Glaetzer said he felt embarrassed after he was dumped out in the early stages at the Commonwealth Games in front of a shocked Australian crowd yesterday.

Glaetzer was the hero on Friday when he romped to gold in the men's keirin, but less than 24 hours later he was stunned by Malaysia's Muhammad Shah Firdaus Sahrom, who came a lowly 34th at the recent world championships. Glaetzer, 25, a hot favourite for sprint gold on Australia's Gold Coast, had qualified fastest and set a Commonwealth Games record of 9.583 seconds in the process. But he tumbled out at the 1/8 finals stage, pipped by 0.024sec to the line by Sahrom, who went on to finish a whisker outside the medals in fourth. Sprint gold went to the New Zealander Sam Webster, who celebrated by lifting his black bike over his head and high into the air. Glaetzer was well gone by then, however. "That was exactly what I didn't want to happen. I tried to get through with minimum effort," said the beaten Australian."I just needed to get my speed going, but the speed just wasn't there. He got the jump on me, so I'm pretty gutted.

"It's devastating, it'll take a little while to get over



this one. To lose like that is embarrassing." He blamed a tactical error: "I was just coming into the bell too slow, I needed to be accelerating not just controlling."

"It's just hard, it's a nightmare unfolding," added Glaetzer, whose keirin victory on Friday was Australia's fifth track cycling gold at these Games. The 22-yearold Sahrom, who had taken the last spot in qualifying at the sold-out, 4,000-capacity Anna Meares Velodrome, was in shock. "It's unbelievable because I'm fighting with a world champion and (Commonwealth) Games record-holder. I just did what I can and it went to plan and I did it," he said. "Matthew Glaetzer is a world champion and he's absolutely fast."It's hard to beat him and I'm very honoured by what I did today." — AFP



Liverpool splutter without **Salah in Everton stalemate**

Third placed Liverpool settle for a point

LIVERPOOL: Liverpool were rendered impotent without Mohamed Salah as they were held to a 0-0 draw by Everton in yesterday's Merseyside derby at Goodison Park. Egypt winger Salah, the key figure in Liverpool's impressive campaign, was left out due to a minor groin injury as Jurgen Klopp tried to give his main man a chance to be fit for their decisive Champions League clash against Manchester City on Tuesday.

Danny Ings and Dominic Solanke looked rusty as they were given rare starts, with the latter failing to take either of two early chances. Roberto Firmino appeared as a late substitute in an attempt to find a winner, but third placed Liverpool had to settle for a point.

They did, though, extend their unbeaten

run in Merseyside derbies to 17 matches, as Seamus Coleman and Dominic Calvert-Lewin both failed to take late Everton chances. Klopp had a big decision to make regarding his team selection, with Liverpool three days away from the second leg of their quarter-final against City following Wednesday's 3-0 victory

The fact that he made five changes showed where his priorities lie at the moment. Ings was starting a league match for the first time since Klopp took charge two-and-a-half years ago, having fought back from two cruciate knee ligament injuries, while Solanke was making only his fourth league start for the club.

In addition, Nathaniel Clyne began a match for the first time in 11 months after recovering from a serious back problem, while central defender Ragnar Klavan was pressed into service at left-back, having played

just 11 minutes since New Year's Day.

Inevitably, given those changes, Liverpool did not click as they usually do. Solanke lacked the kind of sharpness that Salah and Firmino have made second nature.

Dybala hat-trick stretches Juventus lead in Serie A

The Turin giants moved a step closer to a seventh straight Italian title, four days before they travel to Real Madrid needing to overturn a 3-0 deficit to reach the Champions League semi-finals.

Juventus now lead second-placed Napoli, who travel to Chievo today, by seven points. Malian forward Cheick Diabate scored a brace to pull Benevento back into the game twice but the rock-bottom side fell to their 26th defeat in 31 games. "Congratulations to the lads because today was important to win after the defeat against Real Madrid," said Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri. "There are seven games left and today it was too important. "The feeling was that we were at risk, the same feeling I had against AC Milan (last week) when we conceded many shots for the first time in months." "We've got to take every last drop of energy we've got left to go for the Scudetto, Italian Cup and of course the second leg in Madrid. It's not easy to keep winning at that pace," added Allegri.

Dybala-who will miss to trip to Madrid after being red-carded in the first leg-opened the scoring after quarter of an hour and got the second just before the break when he slotted in a penalty awarded after consultation with the video assistant referee.

The 24-year-old completed his treble with a penalty awarded after 74 minutes when Gonzalo Higuain was brought down in the box, before Douglas Costa added the fourth eight minutes from time with a magnificent curling effort. Argentine Dybala who now has 25 goals in all competitions this season.

'NOTHING TO LOSE'

"It's difficult against these sides who have nothing to lose," said Dybala as Juventus allowed their rivals who were 65 points below them before kick-off back into the game. But Tammy Abraham, on loan from Chelsea, punctured any Albion optimism when he headed Swansea's 75th minute equaliser from close-range. West Brom remain rooted to the bottom of the table and sit 10 points from safety with only 15

SAKHIR: Championship leader Sebastian Vettel will start his 200th F1 race from pole position after he and Ferrari team-mate Kimi Raikkonen locked out the front row for today's Bahrain Grand Prix. The German secured his 51st career pole with a supreme lap in the dying seconds of a tense floodlit qualifying session in which Ferrari were dominant. "Yes, P1! Pole position," said Vettel. "That was a lion lap. That was quite intense... I was happy with my first run until I tossed it away in the last corner so I staved away from that kerb in the second run. "The car has been excellent here all weekend."

Valtteri Bottas was third fastest for Mercedes behind the two Ferraris, but ahead of his team-mate Lewis Hamilton who has a five-place grid penalty after an overnight gearbox change and starts from ninth. That promotes Australian Daniel Ricciardo from fifth to fourth for Red Bull ahead of Frenchman Pierre Gasly of Toro Rosso and Dane Kevin Magnussen of Haas.

Bayern Munich win sixth straight title

Bavarian giants are German league champions for 28th time in their history

BERLIN: Bayern Munich were crowned Bundesliga champions for the sixth consecutive season vesterday as James Rodriguez helped turn the game in their 4-1 comeback victory at Augsburg. The result mean Bayern are German league champions for the 28th time in their history, and it was the sixth year in a row they have won the Bundesliga since their treble-winning season in 2013. Augsburg took a shock lead through an own goal by Niklas Suele, but the Bavarians roared back as Corentin Tolisso, James-who then assisted Arjen Robben-and Sandro Wagner all scored.

The result leaves Bayern 20 points clear with five league games left and underlined their absolute dominance of the Bundesliga.

With one eye on Wednesday's Champions League quarter-final second leg against Sevilla, in which Munich hold a slender 2-1 lead, coach Jupp Heynckes gambled by resting his stars. Top scorer Robert Lewandowski, plus Thomas Mueller, Thiago Alcantara, Mats Hummels and Javi Martinez all started on the bench. Sevilla would have encouraged by the comedy of errors in Bayern's defence that led to Augsburg's goal. Jerome Boateng lingered over a back pass and Colombian forward Sergio Cordova robbed him of possession, sending Boateng tumbling to the turf, clutching his hamstring.

Cordova's shot was blocked by Bayern goalkeeper Sven Ulreich, but the ball ricocheted into Suele's face and into Bayern's goal to stun the visitors on 18 minutes. However, Munich were 2-1 up by the time halftime came when Joshua Kimmich's cross picked out Tolisso unmarked in the area to header Bayern level on 32 minutes. Bayern then laid on a top-class goal to take the lead at Augsburg's WWK Arena.

Kimmich was again involved, firing a pass across goal after combining with Robben for Juan Bernat, who

The Colombian then ensured the title was heading to Munich for their third. He hooked the ball back into play at the far post for Robben to drill his shot inside the near post on 62 minutes.

Ribery celebrated his 35th birthday with a cameo appearance for the final eight minutes before Wagner headed home Bayern's late fourth. The Bayarian giants will formally lift the Bundesliga shield after the final day on May 12.

Elsewhere, second-from-bottom Cologne suffered a blow to their survival hopes as they were held to a 1-1 draw by Mainz. An early goal by Cologne's Germany defender Jonas Hector was cancelled out as Pablo De Blasis headed an equaliser for Mainz five minutes into

With five games left, Cologne are six points behind Mainz, who are 16th, which carries a relegation play-off berth against the third-best team in the second tier at the end of the season.

Wolfsburg, who are just above the bottom three, won 2-0 at Freiburg in a match featuring two sides just above the bottom three and fighting to stay up. With just two minutes gone at the Schwarzwald Stadion, Wolves striker Daniel Didavi held off his marker and fired past despairing Freiburg goalkeeper Alexander Schwolow. He added a second with seven minutes remaining.

Thorgan Hazard came off the bench to score twice as Borussia Moenchengladbach climbed to eighth with a 2-1 win at home to Hertha Berlin. Salomon Kalou gave Hertha an early lead, but Hazard come off the bench to score on 75 minutes, then net a late penalty. — AFP

Pogba leads thrilling Man Utd comeback

MANCHESTER: Paul Pogba spoiled Manchester City's anticipated Premier League title party by scoring twice in two minutes as Manchester United came from 2-0 down to win a thrilling derby 3-2 vesterday.

Chris Smalling completed the comeback that looked so improbable when City were well on course to round off a resounding march towards the title by racing into a 2-0 first-half lead. Goals from captain Vincent Kompany and Ilkay Gundogan put the hosts in a commanding position, who were left to rue huge missed chances from Raheem Sterling to extend their lead.

City manager Pep Guardiola added more spice to an already hotly-anticipated clash when he claimed on Friday he had been offered the chance to buy Pogba two months ago by the player's agent Mino Raiola.

Pogba has endured a desperately disappointing season having often been dropped by Jose Mourinho for United's biggest games. But after so much criticism, Pogba showed why he was the world's most expensive player when United splashed out £89 million to bring him back to the club from Juventus in 2016 by hauling United back into a game that looked lost at half-time.

Guardiola kept his pre-match promise to prioritise Tuesday's Champions League quarterfinal second leg against Liverpool with City needing to overturn a 3-0 first leg deficit.

Kevin de Bruyne, a leading candidate for player of the year awards, was left on the bench alongside Gabriel Jesus and City's all-time top goalscorer Sergio Aguero. Guardiola and Mourinho have a long-running rivalry dating back to their time in charge of Barcelona and Real Madrid respectively.

And the game quickly settled into the usual pattern when the two face off with City dominating possession and United happy to get plenty of men behind the ball. Yet, for all City's possession, just like when City won 2-1 at Old Trafford in December, it was from a set-piece that United were undone.

City's Abu-Dhabi owners have splashed an estimated 878 million euros over the past decade to assemble a squad that has tilted the balance of power in Manchester from red to blue. Kompany was one the Emiratis' first purchases, and he was a fitting scorer on what seemed destined to be a historic day.

The Belgian outmuscled Smalling to power home Leroy Sane's corner on 25 minutes. Five minutes later City doubled their lead in a style that has characterised their season as Gundogan brilliantly turned onto Sterling's pass before slotting into the far corner.

City should have been out of sight by halftime as Guardiola screamed in frustration after Sterling fired two glorious chances well over the bar. Unlike in many big games this season, Mourinho played Pogba in his favoured role on the left of a midfield three.

Like the rest of his teammates, Pogba was overrun in the first 45 minutes, but came alive to slot home from Ander Herrera's cushioned pass with his chest to get United back into the game eight minutes after the break

That goal was the first Mourinho's men had scored away from home against top-five opposition in the Premier League all season. And they soon had two in two minutes when Alexis Sanchez picked out Pogba's late run into the box and his header beat Ederson low to his right-hand side. City's Champions League hopes were likely ended by conceding three times in 19 minutes at Anfield in midweek. And United took just 16 minutes to complete an incredible turnaround when Smalling capitalised on some slack City marking to turn home Sanchez's free-kick. - AFP

US-China trade war fears escalate as threats ramp up

WASHINGTON: The escalating trade confrontation between Washington and Beijing threatened to boil over after President Donald Trump lashed out again and China called on the European Union to join the battle, sending global stocks into the red.

Trump remained defiant and argued the pain of the dispute will pay off in the end, while China said that his administration would only "shoot itself in the foot" if it didn't back down from the "extremely wrong" threats. Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin acknowledged there was a risk of a trade war, but said the intention is to defend US interests and the administration remains willing to negotiate.

But top White House economic advisor Larry Kudlow reversed himself, and warned that the tariff threat is not a negotiating tactic. Global stock markets were unhappy with the turn of events, as Wall Street dropped more than two percent, following European and Asian markets lower.

Where do opportunities lie?

In the wake of the decision to impose steep tariffs on steel and aluminum imports, the United States on Tuesday published a list of \$50 billion in Chinese goods to be hit by tariffs over what Washington says is widespread theft of intellectual property and technology.

China retaliated by unveiling planned levies on \$50 billion worth of major US exports including soybeans, cars and small aircraft.

Trump hit back again late Thursday, instructing trade officials to consider tariffs on an additional \$100 billion in imports. "Rather than remedy its misconduct, China has chosen to harm our farmers and manufacturers," Trump said, calling Beijing's reaction "unfair."

So far, only the tariffs on steel and aluminum have taken effect, but Trump's latest threats take the dispute to a new level: China cannot retaliate in kind since it only imports \$130 billion in US products, meaning it would have to find another way to respond.

Amid widespread concern, and calls for restraint from US businesses and farm states most vulnerable to Chinese retaliation, Trump said Friday the outcome would be worth the short-term risk.

"I'm not saying there's not going to be any pain," he told WABC radio in New York, but "we're going to be much stronger for it."—AFP

No progress at NAFTA talks, US timeline could be in doubt

Major issues still remain to be tackled

WASHINGTON/OTTAWA: The United States, Mexico and Canada still have to resolve major issues around NAFTA, Canadian Foreign Minister Chrystia Freeland said on Friday, casting doubt that the quick deal sought by Washington would materialize.

Freeland met with US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer and Mexican Economy Minister Ildefonso Guajardo for several hours on Friday but made clear there was a lack of consensus on the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). "We had some constructive conversations both yesterday and today ... and that intensive pace of work, which has been happening over the last couple of weeks, will continue in the days to come," she told reporters outside the Washington building where the talks took place.

"We are going to keep on working until we get a good deal," she added, saying negotiations would continue at the level of officials. Lighthizer, citing the need to reach a deal an agreement before the Mexican presidential election on July 1, says he wants the outlines of a deal soon to update the regional trade agreement.

A brief statement from Lighthizer's office said the talks had been positive and added that "we will continue working to achieve an agreement that benefits our three countries."

Mexico's economy ministry said the three countries agreed on Friday that their negotiating teams should press on with technical work in coming days and try to find "the balance that enables the process to move forward in its entirety."

Mexican business lobby CCE said in a statement that it would accompany the country's negotiating team. "The continuation of the meetings is a positive sign, and there is a window of opportunity to advance substantially towards an agreement," Juan Pablo

US President Donald Trump, who has repeatedly threatened to walk away from the \$1.2 trillion pact unless major changes are made, on Thursday said the three nations should have something to announce fairly soon. Unveiling the outlines of a deal-which Canadian and Mexican officials had initially suggested might happen at a regional summit in Peru next weekwould allow leaders to claim a political victory while leaving officials to work out the precise details in the months to come.

It would also enable Trump and his trade team to focus on a widening trade dispute with China that could hurt the world's two biggest economies.

But there are major challenges to overcome, in particular a contentious U.S. demand that the North American content of vehicles made in NAFTA countries be increased to 85 percent from 62.5 percent.

"We continue to work in that area and to make some good progress and advances," said Freeland, who gave no details. Insiders say the issue of automotive content has to be nailed down before an agreement in principle can be struck.

"We are dealing in black and white. You can't leave things gray," said one source with direct knowledge of the talks, citing the huge complexity of the industry.

"The last thing you want to do is to be making something that isn't compliant and to be told in an audit, 'You're not NAFTA compliant and you owe duties," said the source, who requested anonymity given the sensitivity of the situation.

Talks to modernize NAFTA started last August but have made little progress, prompting the United States to suggest at the end of the seventh formal round last



month that the three nations aim in the first instance for a deal in principle.

The lack of clarity over the pact's future has hit the Canadian and Mexican currencies in recent months as well as worried financial markets, which are on edge about possible damage to the highly

cent on aluminum, citing national security concerns.

The tariffs came into effect on March 23. Some countries were exempted, at least temporarily, but not China. China is the world's top producer of steel and aluminum, but it accounts for only 2 percent of steel imports into the United States and 10 percent of aluminum.

Intellectual property

Trump also accuses China of unfair competition and stealing US intellectual property in the form of its inventions and innovation.

On March 23, the United States launched a challenge at the World Trade Organization against China over intellectual property breaches. Foreign companies have long complained about Beijing's failure to protect know-how and patents, in some cases forcing firms to share information with domestic partners as the price for doing business in the massive Chinese market. In August 2017 Washington formally started a trade investigation into China's intellectual property practices and the forced transfer of US technology under Section 301 of US trade law, which addresses intellectual property.

Products hit by US-China trade tensions

PARIS: Steel, soybeans, aircraft... The list of products hit by trade tensions between the United States and China increases almost daily. US President Donald Trump, who has vowed repeatedly to reduce the trade deficit, began a series of announcement of tariffs.

The US trade deficit with China rose to \$375 billion in 2017 out of a total of \$566 billion.

Some measures have come into effect while others are in waiting, with both Washington and Beijing having detailed plans to levy charges on goods worth \$50 billion. On Thursday, US President Donald Trump threatened to impose duties on another \$100 billion of Chinese imports. Here is an overview of the main products targeted in the escalating trade duel between the world's two top economies. new duties, targeting products from various sectors including aeronautics, information and communication technologies, and robotics and machinery.

A few hours after the publication of the US target list, Beijing announced duties of 25 percent on the US aeronautics and automobile sectors. In the aeronautics sector, the tariffs target planes weighing no more than 45,000 kg-smaller than the long-range commercial jets made by Boeing, but the fate of medium-range 737 jets is left uncertain. Boeing says it is "confident that dialogue continues".

Agricultural products

In its response Beijing also targets soybeans with duties of 25 percent, an action aimed the heart of the US economy because China buys 61 percent of total US soybean exports and more than 30 percent of overall US production of this cereal.

US job creation falls in March; unemployment steady at 4.1%

US employers add only 103,000 net new positions

Decline due

to harsh

weather

WASHINGTON: Monthly job creation in the world's largest economy tumbled in March to its lowest level since September, the government reported Friday, a decline attributed in large part to harsh weather. The slowdown in hiring was likely to be unwelcome news at the White House, as President Donald Trump presses ahead on a multi-front confrontation with China and other trading partners that has alarmed much of the business community and

Republican Party.

US employers added only 103,000 net new positions last month, the Labor Department said in the closely-watched report. That gain was less than a third of the surge seen in February and far lower than the 175,000 analysts expected.

But the unemployment rate held steady at

the 17-year-low of 4.1 percent for the sixth month in a row while wages rose faster than expected, according to the report.

The weak hiring followed more trade turmoil overnight, as Trump sharply raised the ante in a fresh tit-for-tat exchange with Beijing, calling for tariffs on an additional \$100 billion in Chinese imports.

US financial markets dove Friday on the trade brinkmanship and jobs data double-whammy.

But analysts said the March jobs slowdown was at least partly attributable to weather effects, with February hiring boosted by unusually warm temperatures that were then chilled by wintery conditions last month. And despite a steep downward revision to January, an upward revision made February's results even stronger, putting average job creation for the first quarter of the year at 202,000, well above the 188,000 average recorded in all of 2017.

"The weakness in payrolls likely reflected payback for exaggerated strength

rather than weather effects in March alone," Jim O'Sullivan of High Frequency Economics said in a client note.

"The trend remains more than strong enough to keep unemployment trending down over time.'

Job creation slowed precipitously or even reversed in industrial sectors across the econ-

omy, which gave back some of the gains recorded in February's monster hiring spree.

The construction workforce shed 15,000 positions-a sector more vulnerable to weather-while the retail industry shrank by 4,400 employees. Even sectors that posted gains, such as manufacturing, health care and mining, saw job creation slow while government hiring was negligible.

Fears of a faster Fed? Meanwhile, worker wages rose faster than econo-

mists had predicted, gaining 0.3 percent for the month to an average of \$26.82 an hour. Worker pay is now up a robust 2.7 percent over March 2017, well above the 2.3 percent gain in the Consumer Price Index for the same period-suggesting a tight labor market may at last be driving up compensation and could spur higher inflation.

However Chris Low of FTN Financial said those

fearing higher interest rates from the Federal Reserve this year could relax a little since "the possibility the Fed would abandon gradual in favor of more aggressive tightening has diminished." Markets have been on tenterhooks since February, fearing the central bank could raise rates four times this year instead of the forecast three amid gathering forces that could accelerate price pressures. — AFP

American Airlines orders 47 Boeing 787s, cancels A350 order

SAN FRANCISCO: American Airlines has ordered 47 Boeing 787 Dreamliners in a deal valued at \$12 billion at list prices, while cancelling a major order for Airbus A350s.

The order comprises 22 787-8s scheduled to begin arriving in 2020 and 25 787-9s scheduled to begin arriving in 2023. They will gradually replace Boeing 767s and 777s along with European Airbus A330s, American said Friday. The sale brings American Airlines' total number of 787s to 89 aircraft. Though the total value is \$12 billion at list price, the final price paid by airlines is generally lower.

American Airlines said: "As part of the strategy to simplify its fleet, American agreed with Airbus today to terminate its order for 22 A350s, which was originally placed by US Airways," which it bought in 2013.

"This was a difficult decision between the Boeing 787 and the Airbus A350 and A330neo and we thank both manufacturers for their aggressive efforts to earn more of American's business. In the end, our goal to simplify our fleet made the 787 a more compelling choice," said American Airlines presi-

dent Robert Isom. Chief financial officer Derek Kerr added advantages of carrying common fleet types included "creating less friction in our operation when aircraft swaps are necessary, reducing inventory needs, and creating a more consistent service for customers and team members.'

American Airlines also said it had deferred delivery of 40 Boeing 737 MAX aircraft previously scheduled to arrive between 2020 and 2022. The carrier said the revised schedule "will better align with planned retirements of other narrowbody aircraft."

The order for US manufacturer Boeing

comes in the wake of protectionist trade measures by President Donald Trump, who champions buying from US manufacturers. "We are extremely honored that American Airlines is deepening its commitment to the 787 Dreamliner," said Boeing Commercial Airplanes president Kevin McAllister in a statement. Boeing says it has more than 1,350 orders registered for the 787. Meanwhile, Airbus announced earlier Friday it recorded 45 net orders during the first three months of 2018, and delivered 121 aircraft. The company said its overall backlog of jetliners to be delivered stood at 7,189 as of March 31. - AFP

KUWAIT: Boursa Kuwait ended last week in the red zone. The Premier Market Index closed at 4,793.50 points, down by 4.13 percent, the Main Market Index decreased by 2.64 percent after closing at 4,867.87 points, whereas the All-Share Market Index closed at 4,820.80 points down by 3.58 percent. Furthermore, last week's average daily turnover decreased by 5.97 percent, compared to the preceding week, reaching KD 11.41 million, whereas trading volume average was 45.02 million shares, recording a decrease of 7.60 percent.

The Boursa recorded declines this week affected by the selling pressures that included many listed stocks in the Market, headed by the leading stocks listed in the Premier Market, which received most of the traded cash liquidity during the week, and was apparent on the Premier Market Index, the most declining among the three markets indices, where it recorded a loss of over 4 percent in the last week. The Boursa witnessed such performance in parallel with the drop in the trading indicators, where the total volume during the week decreased by 7.60 percent reaching 225.12 million stock, and the value declined by 5.97 percent reaching KD 57.07 million.



The Market lost more than KD 1 billion in five sessions only, as the market capitalization for the total listed stocks dropped by the end of the week to around KD 26.50 billion against KD 27.86 billion in the previous week, down by 4.85 percent. (Note: The market capitalization for the listed companies in the Market is calculated based on the weighted average number of outstanding shares as per the latest available official financial statements).

As far as the daily trading activity during the last week; the Boursa initiated the first session, which came in parallel with launching the Market Development 2, with a decline in its three indices, affected by the selling operations that the Market witnessed on many stocks. The Premier Market Index was the most declining by the end of the session, due to the concentration of the selling operations on the heavy stocks. The next session witnessed a decrease in the three Market indices, headed by the Main Market, which lost more than 100 point by the end of the session, recording a loss of 2.08 percent, and came as a result to the continued selling trend in controlling the trading operations in the Market, amid concentration of the cash liquidity on the Premier Market stocks, as its Index declined by 1.03 percent by the end of the session, while the All Share Index decreased by 1.42 percent.

The Boursa continued its downward sloping in the mid-week session amid a drop in the cash liquidity and the increased selling pressures over the leading stocks, which was reflected on the Premier Market Index in particular, to receive around 75 percent of the cash liquidity during the session. However, the selling operations sharpness declined on Wednesday's session, which witnessed a fluctuated closings of the Market indices for the first time since its new launch, as the All Share Index and the Premier

Market Index continued to decrease, while the Main Market Index was able to realize a limited increase by the end of the session, supported by the purchasing operations that included some small-cap stocks. The end of week session witnessed a return to the three Boursa indices to meet in the red zone once again, whereas it recorded limited declines affected by the continued selling operations in controlling the trading activity, amid a continued decline to the cash liquidity which decreased by 1.60 percent, while the number of traded stocks grew by 4.66 percent at the end of the session.

Sectors' Indices

Nine of Boursa Kuwait's sectors ended last week in the red zone, two recorded increases, whereas the Health Care sector's index closed with no change. The Consumer Goods sector headed the losers list as its index declined by 7.62 percent to end the week's activity at 923.80 points. The Telecommunications sector was second on the losers' list, which index declined by 6.46 percent, closing at 935.41 points, followed by the Banks sector, as its index closed at 957.42 points at a loss of 4.26 percent. The Real Estate sector was the least declining as its index closed at 990.49 points with a 0.95 percent decrease. On the other hand, last week's highest gainer was the Technology sector, achieving 3.59 percent growth rate as its index closed at 1,035.86 points. Whereas, in the second place, the Consumer Services sector's index closed at 1,000.40 points recording 0.04 percent increase.

Sectors' Activity

The Banks sector dominated a total trade volume of around 70.56 million shares changing hands during last week, representing 31.35 percent of the total market trading volume. The Real Estate sector was second in terms of trading volume as the sector's traded shares were 21.36 percent of last week's total trading volume, with a total of around 48.08 million shares.

On the other hand, the Banks sector's stocks were the highest traded in terms of value; with a turnover of around KD 31.61 million or 55.38 percent of last week's total market trading value. The Industrial sector took the second place as the sector's last week turnover was approx. KD 8.88 million representing 15.55 percent of the total market trading value. —Prepared by: Studies & Research Department - Bayan Investment Co.

Wall St ends down 2% as US-China trade fears intensify

NEW YORK: US stocks dropped about 2 percent on Friday, with the Dow falling more than 570 points, as US President Donald Trump's latest tariff threat on Chinese imports fueled increasing concern over a US trade war with China.

Stocks added to losses and hit session lows in afternoon trading after Federal Reserve Chairman Jerome Powell said the US central bank will likely need to keep hiking interest rates to keep inflation under control and said it was too soon to know if rising trade tensions would hit the US economy.

Fears of a trade war since Trump announced tariffs on steel and aluminum imports more than a month ago have kept investors on edge over concerns that such protectionist measures would hit global economic growth. "It's a reaction to concerns about the administration's approach to trade. The market has vacillated between writing it off as just talk and assuming there could be a serious problem," said Rick Meckler, president of investment firm LibertyView Capital Management in Jersey City, New Jersey.

He and others said investors also appeared to be reducing risk ahead of the weekend. "If the market is down it often tends to accelerate on Friday. Investors don't want to take the risk of coming in Monday after having something happen over the weekend," Meckler said. Trump late Thursday threatened to slap \$100 billion more in tariffs on Chinese imports, while Beijing said it was fully prepared to respond with a "fierce counter strike".US companies seen as more likely to be hit by trade tensions with China were among the biggest drags on the Dow, including Boeing, down 3.1 percent. The S&P 500 industrials index, down 2.7 percent, had the biggest losses among sectors, though selling was broad-based.

Chipmakers, which as a group rely on China for about a quarter of their revenue, also declined. The Philadelphia semiconductor index fell 3.1 percent. The Dow Jones Industrial Average fell 572.46 points, or 2.34 percent, to 23,932.76, the S&P 500 lost 58.37 points, or 2.19 percent, to 2,604.47 and the Nasdaq Composite dropped 161.44 points, or 2.28 percent, to 6,915.11. The trade war worries continued to pressure stocks even as Trump administration officials sought to dampen concerns. Trump's top economic adviser Larry Kudlow said in various interviews that he learned of the new tariffs on Thursday night, but also said there are ongoing talks on trade between the United States and China.

US Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin in an interview on CNBC said he was cautiously hopeful the United States will reach an agreement with China on trade. The S&P 500 ended just above its 200-day moving average after trading well below that key support level that is watched by technical analysts.

Powell, who was speaking on the US economic outlook in Chicago, also said the labor market appeared close to full employment. It was his first speech on the economic outlook since taking over as chairman on Feb. 5. Before the session started, a Labor Department report showed nonfarm payrolls increased by a smaller-than-expected 103,000 last month. While annual growth in average hourly earnings rose to 2.7 percent, it stayed below the 3 percent that economists estimate is needed to lift inflation toward the Federal Reserve's 2percent target. —Reuters

As eSports grow, China teams make themselves at home

LPL's 'home stadiums' put China ahead of the curve

HANGZHOU, China: Tucked away in a nondescript furniture mall, LGD Gaming's multimillion-dollar eSports home venue may not bring to mind Old Trafford or Yankee Stadium, but it could represent the future of sport. The 400-seat arena in the eastern Chinese city of Hangzhou packs in pumped-up fans several times a month for LGD's matches in the League of Legends Pro League (LPL), a 14-club professional eSports competition that this year began playing in purpose-built home venues.

ESports is booming in China, driven by popular games such as League of Legends and Dota 2, raising hopes of eventual Olympic inclusion and turning young players into rich celebrities. Specially designed eSports arenas are appearing in the United States and China to accommodate growing crowds attending multi-team tournaments. But the LPL's "home stadiums" put China ahead of the curve, industry insiders said.

"Home venues let the club localize its fan base," said Yang Shunhua, LGD's general manager. "It gives fans more opportunity to meet the athletes and clubs. It's the future of eSports." Beginning play in 2013, LPL matches were staged in Shanghai, Yang said. But

Chinese internet giant Tencent, the league's owner, is encouraging teams to lay down local roots. Three clubs now have home arenas-the others are in the southwestern cities of Chongqing and Chengdu-and more are planned, Yang said.

Home sweet home

Whether the strategy proves successful remains to be seen, but there is no short-

age of ambition at LGD's flashy facility, which Yang said cost 30 million yuan. Occupying 2,200 square meters, it features press conference venues, fan zones, practice spaces, a bar, gift shop and high-tech control rooms where squads of young technicians coordinate web broadcasts to millions of spectators.

On stage, LGD's five-man squad sit like astronauts at futuristic consoles, controlling avatars who battle a team from the city of Nanjing on a seven-meter wide screen above them. Announcers breathlessly call the action, play-

by-play. In the stands, around 400 fans, sitting in chairs with massage functions, bang thundersticks and roar whenever the on-screen action-a frantic brawl in a fantasy world-heats up.

Yao Jian, 23, used to stock up on snacks and binge-watch eSports on his phone or computer at home in the city of Wuxi. Now he regularly makes the severalhour trip to Hangzhou. "The atmosphere at the stadium is explosive," he said, adding that even an "introvert" like him ends up cheering. "Home stadiums give us a sense of

belonging." Chinese eSports is increasingly resembling big-time sports in other ways as well. LGD's full squad is mostly Chinese but includes two Korean imports and Yang says transfer fees for top LPL players have reached several million dollars.

Game on

The global professional eSports industry will grow 38 percent in 2018 to \$906 million in revenue, industry analyst Newzoo has forecast, with China representing 18 percent of that, third behind the US and Europe. Around 380



million fans worldwide will watch professional eSports events this year, Newzoo said. US-based Allied Esports has built several venues in the United States, Europe and China, where it also organizes competitions.

CEO Jud Hannigan said Allied Ésports, a consortium of Chinese sports and entertainment companies, is talking with several other cities in China, hoping to add to its arenas in Beijing and Shenzhen. "Previously you had to find space to rent, plus equipment and people. You could spend millions of dollars to set up a space over five days, only to rip it down. It's not very efficient," he said. "We are having a lot of interesting conversations with cities that recognize this is where the future is and they are saying 'how do we bring this to our town?'

Top Chinese LPL players earn as much as \$1.5 million per year, Yang said. "It gives our youths more choices. It's not like before when all you could do was study. Now there are other roads," he said. LGD's 23-year-old captain Chen Bo admits he was a truant, blowing off school to play computer games-to his parents' dismay. But mum and dad feel better now that his growing earnings bought them a previously out-of-reach house and car.

A home stadium brings committed, adoring fans. But Chen, whose player handle is "Pyl", eschews the female supporters who send gifts and dating requests. At LGD's match, several of them held illuminated screens with messages of support for their heroes. Chen admits fan-player romances are common, but says the pro game's highstakes pressure, in which one weak performance can cripple a career, leaves him little time for that. "When playing professionally it can be pretty hard on the woman because there is so little time to spend with them," he said.—AFP

Facebook apologizes after Myanmar groups blast Zuckerberg

YANGON: Facebook apologized on Friday to Myanmar civil society groups who took issue with Mark Zuckerberg's defense of the platform's record on curbing hate speech roiling the country. Facebook has been battered by allegations that posts on its site have helped fuel communal bloodshed in Myanmar, a mainly Buddhist country accused of waging an ethnic cleansing campaign against Rohingya Muslims.

On Thursday six Myanmar organizations published an open letter criticizing an interview Zuckerberg gave with news site Vox this week. In it he cited examples of both Myanmar Buddhists and Muslims spreading "sensational" messages on Facebook Messenger that warned of imminent violence from the other community. "That's the kind of



thing where I think it is clear that people were trying to use our tools in order to incite real harm. Now, in that case, our systems detect that that's going on. We stop those messages from going through," Zuckerberg was quoted as saying.

In their letter the six local tech and human rights organizations said they were "surprised" to hear Zuckerberg "praise the effectiveness" of Facebook's systems in Myanmar. "It took over four days from when the messages started circulating for the escalation to reach you," said the groups, who had flagged the worrying content to Facebook. "Far from being stopped, they spread in an unprece-

dented way, reaching country-wide and causing widespread fear and at least three violent incidents in the process.'

When reached for a comment on Friday, a Facebook spokesperson conceded the company was too slow in responding to reports about the incendiary messages. "We should have been faster and are working hard to improve our technology and tools to detect and prevent abusive, hateful or false content," the spokesperson said by email. "We are sorry that Mark did not make clearer that it was the civil society groups in Myanmar who first reported these messages."

Facebook has also added more Myanmar-language reviewers and is rolling out the ability to report content in the Messenger service, the spokesperson added. In late January Facebook removed the page of popular monk Wirathu, known for virulent anti-Rohingya rhetoric. Last year it regulated the use of the word "kalar" which is considered derogatory against Muslims.

Facebook a 'beast'

In their joint letter the local groups said Facebook's handling of hate speech and vicious rumors in Myanmar has been "inadequate" for years, adding that their offers to craft broader solutions have gone unanswered. They urged the social media giant to add reporting mechanisms to the Messenger app, increase transparency, engage more with local stakeholders and draw on data and engineering teams to identify repeat offenders.

"Facebook doesn't have an office in Myanmar," Jes Kaliebe Petersen, CEO of Phandeevar, a Yangon tech hub that signed the letter, said. "We don't really see much of a commitment to dedicate resources to fix what's going on Facebook in Myanmar," he added. Facebook dwarfs all other social media platforms in Myanmar, with even the government and the military using it to make public announcements.

But it has come under fire for allegedly helping broadcast ethnic hatred in a fledgling democracy still emerging from decades of repressive junta rule. Scrutiny has intensified in the wake of a bloody military campaign against the Rohingya that erupted last August, expelling some 700,000 of the minority to Bangladesh. In March the UN's special rapporteur to Myanmar Ýanghee Lee said Facebook had morphed into a "beast" and had incited "a lot of violence and a lot of hatred against the Rohingya or other ethnic minorities".--AFP

who revolutionized on demand music listening for millions of people, is a resilient entrepreneur from a Swedish working-class suburb whose no-nonsense attitude has drawn investors and staff alike. A casual dresser with his habitual sneakers, T-shirt and blazer, the 35-year-old is known for being extremely tight-lipped about the financial deals of the world's largest music streaming company, which he co-founded with Martin Lorentzon in 2006.

"He is shy, comes from a working-class background and was very interested in computers and music early on," said Pelle Snickars, co-author of a forthcoming book, "The Swedish Unicorn: the story about Spotify". "He's quite Swedish in terms of values: we don't see him on magazine covers alongside celebrities, he's not hierarchical and does not hesitate to showcase his collaborators," Snickars said. Ek's pragmatic approach has endeared him to investors, consumers and employees. On Tuesday, Spotify, which has never made a profit, soared to a market capitalization of more than \$26 billion in its longawaited debut on the New York Stock Exchange.

Combining things

With 9.2 percent of capital and 37.3 percent of voting rights, according to industry sources, Ek potentially holds a \$2.4 billion fortune. In 2006, Ek and Lorentzon came up with the idea of creating a legal platform to distribute music online, which at the time was dominated by illegal file sharing sites. The duo experimented with sharing mp3 music files between the hard drives on their computers. And in October 2008 Spotify was finally ready to go live after Ek pleaded with music labels to open their catalogues.

"Innovations are never entirely new," Ek told the Royal Institute of Technology (KTH) in Stockholm during a 2013 visit. "The success comes from combining things that already exist and trying to solve a problem that one is really involved in," added Ek, who reportedly dropped out of the university's engineering program to pursue an IT career.

'Far Cry 5' record sales buoy gamemaker **Ubisoft's shares**

PARIS: French videogame powerhouse Ubisoft saw its share price surge over six percent on the Paris CAC stock exchange Thursday, buoyed by record global sales of its "Far Cry 5" shooting game. Within just a week of its launch the latest instalment in Ubisoft's blockbuster franchise pulled in \$310 million. "Far Cry 5" is now the fastest selling title in the franchise's history, Ubisoft said in a statement on Wednesday.

It pits players against a dangerous, violent cult, and is the first in the series to be set in the United States. Previous editions played out in places such as jungles in Africa, Himalayan mountains and an archipelago in the South Pacific. The game sees players immersed in an ultraviolent world, fighting

Room to learn and grow

His perseverance in a rapidly transforming sector may have led to the remarkable rise and survival of the start-up, but artists have complained of it paying them too little and cannibalizing sales from their albums. Taylor Swift ended her contract with Spotify in 2014 over fees and returned three years later. And on March 29, she tweeted that her new video "Delicate" would only be launched on the service.

"Sometimes we succeed, sometimes we stumble. The constant is that we believe we are still early in our journey and we have room to learn and grow," Ek said in an April 2 blog post. "My job is to ensure that we keep our foot on the pedal during the ups, so that we don't become complacent, and that we continue to stay the course with a firm grip on the wheel during the downs," he added. He has repeatedly argued that streaming is a better alternative for artists and that "piracy doesn't pay (them) a penny-nothing, zilch, zero".

Cat out of the bag

In their book "The Swedish Unicorn", a name referring to billion dollar startups, Pelle Snickars

"a fanatical doomsday cult", Ubisoft said.

"Far Cry 5 offers players total freedom to navigate a serene-looking yet deeply twisted world as the new junior deputy of fictional Hope County, Montana," it added. The idea of bringing "Far Cry" to the US was considered early in the franchise, but it was only after political tumult gained momentum in recent years that the plan cemented, executive producer Dan Hay said last year.

Hay insisted that the game is not a commentary on politics in the United States, while admitting it was developed amid feelings that American society wasn't as safe as one might hope. "I'm proud that the culmination of years of passionate work from the team is paying off, and that Far Cry 5's experience resonates with so many people," Hay said, according to the latest statement from Ubisoft. In Thursday morning trading, Ubisoft saw its share price jump 6.3 percent to 70.90 euros.

Bolivia's jaguars facing threat from Chinese fang craze

Jaguar's future in the hands of anti-trafficking police



LA PAZ: This picture shows Jaguar canines, which trafficking to China - to be used in jewelry and as an aphrodisiac - has turned into a lucrative enterprise.

LA PAZ: Bolivia's once-thriving jaguar population is loping into the cross-hairs of a growing threat from poachers responding to growing Chinese demand for the animal's teeth and skull. Researchers believe there are around 7,000 of the speckled big cats in Bolivia, out of a global population of some 64,000, stretching from North America to Argentina. But such is the appetite in China's huge underground market that "if controls are not put in place, it can lead to a serious problem" for their survival, warned Fabiola Suarez of the Environment Ministry.

Considered vulnerable by conservationists, the jaguar's future in the South American country is in the hands of anti-trafficking police only now coming to grips with the potential scale of the problem. Local authorities began getting reports in 2014 of trade in the animal in the northeastern area of Beni, according to Rodrigo Herrera, an advisor to Bolivia's directorate of Biodiversity at the Environment Ministry. He says the increased presence of Chinese nationals in the South American country has stimulated demand.

seven billion dollars' worth of public works contracts to Chinese groups, sparking an influx of workers from the Asian giant. Herrera said each of the cat's teeth, which

measure between eight and 10 centimeters, can fetch up to \$100 for poachers, but that figure can reach \$5,000 on the Chinese market. The feline's skull is also prized by traffickers, at rates of up to \$1,000. Traffickers also sell the skin, and even the testicles, which along with ground-down the teeth, are prized by some Chinese as an aphrodisiac.

While trade in the jaguar or its body parts are prohibit-President Evo Morales' leftist government has awarded ed, the big cats have been listed as "near threatened" on

the International Union for the Conservation of Nature's "Red List". Herrera said that "from every animal, a poor person can take in up to \$2,000. That's a lot of money." In



Conservationists fear the money is an added incentive to farmers who often shoot jaguars to protect their livestock. To date, Bolivian police have intercepted 400 jaguar teeth being sent in the mail to addresses in China. But Suarez, a specialist in the bio-

diversity department in the Environment Ministry, said this is likely only the tip of the iceberg and describes as alarming the quantity she believes has already left the country undetected. The state has belatedly begun to hit back, mounting 15 separate prosecutions, including 11 against Chinese nationals living in Bolivia, according to official data. But the trade continues. On March 19, a trafficker selling jaguar teeth and skulls on social networks was arrested in the Amazon region. Unusually, the Chinese embassy in La Paz has acted to warn its nationals to steer clear of trafficking, reminding them in a note to "respect and strictly observe the laws and regulations, both Chinese and Bolivian, against the illegal trafficking of wild animals.'

According to Bolivia's National Statistics Institute, more and more Chinese are coming to live in Bolivia. In 2011, there were only 2,624 Chinese nationals living in the country, but the figure jumped to 12,861 by 2016. Herrera said the growing presence of Chinese has created a market back home in China, where wearing jaguar's teeth in a necklace, or attached to a key ring, is a status symbol. The largest cat species in the Americas, its habitat extends from the northern United States across South America to Argentina.—AFP

Popularizing the ukulele, with mischievous punk spirit

The ukulele has two obvious selling points: it is affordable and easy to carry. But could the unassuming four-string instrument also incarnate the spirit of punk rock? Since forming three decades ago, the Ukulele Orchestra of Great Britain has helped build a new audience for what it calls the "bonsai guitar," playing musically faithful but thoroughly tongue-in-cheek renditions of popular tunes. Starting its latest US tour, the orchestra-clad in evening finest, including tuxedo jackets and bow ties-quickly pulled in dozens of smartphonesnapping onlookers as the eight ukuleleists strummed their way through AC/DC's "Highway to Hell."

Playing with the Australian headbangers' poetry, soloist Ben Rouse sang, "Hey Satan / Paying my dues / Playing in a ukulele band," as the players raised their instruments to the heavens in mock defiance. Asked why he took up the ukulele, fellow player Jonty Bankes said, "Basically, it's cheap and rather easy to play, so for people

like us it was a godsend." But the self-styled orchestra has noticed a power in the tiny instrument over the yearswith gigs including two nights at Carnegie Hall, a set at the Glastonbury Festival in England and a private party at Windsor Castle for Queen Elizabeth II's 90th birthday. "The thing is, when you bring a ukulele out and start playing it, it does actually make people smile," Bankes said. "It's an unthreatening, friendly instrument which causes a bit of happiness worldwide, really," he said.

Started as a joke

Co-founded by Kitty Lux-whose death last year at 59 brought a rare serious note to the ensemble with a memorial concert-the group initially was interested not in the ukulele itself but in the irreverent energy of punk rock, then on its wane. "Punks could form a band and play three chords, if indeed they could play three. The way that the band started, the same thing happened"

said Leisa Rea, who nonetheless had learned guitar before ukulele.

"The instrument was a bit of a joke, I suppose, and we turned everything on its head. The spirit of punk is alive in the band," she said. "We don't take ourselves too seriously. We're British, so we've got to have some sense of humor, really," she said. Rea fronted the group for its take of the Eurythmics' "Sweet Dreams (Are Made of This)," with an amplified bass ukulele holding the rhythm under seven ukuleles of different pitches. "It's a good way of detecting if a song is any good," she said. "If you can play it on a ukulele, it's a pretty good sign that it's a decent song."

From irony to mainstream

Despite the orchestra's wide travels, it has never played in Hawaii, the birthplace of the instrument initially modeled after a miniature Portuguese guitar. The group is eager to make it to the island chain, but its failure so far

to make it there is not entirely accidental. The orchestra avoids Hawaiian music-as well as songs of early 20thcentury British film star and ukulele enthusiast George Formby-as it instead tries to surprise audiences.

But the ukulele has become less of an oddity for audiences since the band's formation in 1985. Native Hawaiian artist Israel Kamakawiwo'ole found an international following in the 1990s with his mellow ukulele songs, while pop artists, notably the indie rock godfather Stephin Merritt, have found ample possibilities with the ukulele. Orchestra member Dave Suich said he hoped the group has helped increase the popularity of the ukulele, especially in schools, where the little four-stringer has been giving stiff competition to the recorder as a first instrument for children. "People younger than 40 don't know that it's funny," Suich said. "They just think you play an instrument." — AFP

Cecil Taylor, rebellious jazz pianist, dead at 89



Schwarzenegger back home after heart surgery

ction hero Arnold Schwarzenegger is back home in Los Angeles and in good spirits after undergoing open heart surgery following complications with a routine operation, his spokesman said on Friday. The 70-year-old "Terminator" and "Predator" star, and former governor of California, was at the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, near Hollywood, to have a valve replaced on March 29 when doctors opted for the emergency procedure. "Update: Schwarzenegger comes home," his representative Daniel Ketchell posted on Twitter, later clarifying to AFP that Schwarzenegger had been released Friday afternoon and was "recovering at home in fantastic spirits."

The former Mr Universe underwent non-urgent heart surgery in 1997 to have the valve put in, due to a condition he said was congenital and had nothing to do with steroids. "That 1997 replacement valve was never meant to be permanent, and has outlived its life expectancy, so he chose to replace it... through a less-invasive catheter valve replacement," Ketchell said after the successful operation. Schwarzenegger has been tweeting during his stay at the Cedars-Sinai Medical Center, telling fans on Monday that "It's true: I'm back!"-a play on his famous catchphrase "I'll be back!" He has used the line-or close variations-in numerous movies, including "The Terminator," "Commando," "Raw Deal," "The Running Man," "Twins," "Total Recall," "Kindergarten Cop," "Last Action Hero," "Jingle All the Way," "The 6th Day" and "The Expendables II." The Austrian-born former bodybuilder was voted in as governor of California in a historic 2003 recall vote-but proved the win was no fluke by routing opponent





Chief approach to the keys helped set the stage for the free jazz movement, has died, his representative said Friday. He was 89. The New York native, who lived more than three decades in a brownstone in Brooklyn, died late Thursday, his legal guardian Adam Wilner said without specifying a cause. Taylor startled the music world in 1956 with his first album "Jazz Advance," with the pianist wildly sweeping through ostensibly jarring chords and merging clashing rhythms.

With saxophonist Ornette Coleman, who would become his collaborator, Taylor opened the way of free jazz, which removed itself from the structures and toe-tapping rhythms that had underpinned the genre. "Part of what this music is about is not to be delineated exactly. It's about magic and capturing spirits," Taylor once told the jazz writer Nat Hentoff. Taylor followed up with a well-regarded live album in 1957 recorded at the Newport Jazz Festival.

Unlike the legendary Coleman, who died in 2015, Taylor was a more divisive character to audiences, some of whom found his hard-hitting, often atonal playing to be offputting. But Taylor found an unexpected fan in 1978 when he was invited to play at the White House as part of a jazz festival. After performing for his designated time of a mere five minutes, Taylor was unexpectedly approached by president Jimmy Carter, who clasped the artist's hands and said: "I've never seen anyone play the piano that way." Taylor was trained classically in piano, encouraged by his mother who was a musician and dancer, but first found his calling as he made his way into jazz clubs in Harlem. He later obtained financial stability by taking visiting teaching positions, including at the University of Wisconsin at Madison, and his recordings enjoyed popularity in Europe and Japan. Taylor set his music to choreography, including of Min Tanaka, who experiments with Japan's intricate butoh dance. He also worked closely with Amiri Baraka, one of the leading African American poets of the late 20th century, with Taylor also penning his own verse for their work together. — AFP

Russell Crowe's \$104M violin high note of Sydney auction

128-year-old Italian violin that Russell Crowe learned to play in a few months before he starred in the 19th century war drama "Master and Commander" stole the show among movie memorabilia on offer at the Oscar-winning actor's auction yesterday. The rare instrument by Leandro Bislach sold for 135,000 Australian dollars (\$104,000), the highest price for movie-related offerings among 227 lots up for sale in Sydney as part of the Australia-based New Zealander's divorce settlement. More surprisingly, a costume that Crowe wore in the same 2003 movie wasn't far behind, raking in AU\$115,000.

While the violin was close to the top of Sotheby Australia's valuation, the winning bid for character Captain Jack Aubrey's dress uniform exceeded the auctioneer's hopes by AU\$80,000. The violin's price was only exceeded by a painting from Crowe's extensive collection by Australian artist Brett Whiteley, "Moreton Bay Fig and Palms," which sold for AU\$190,000. The auction, titled "The Art of Divorce," took place on the actor's 54th birthday and the anniversary of his wedding to singer Danielle Spencer in 2003. A cheerful Crowe made an appearance after Sydney actress-singer Alisa Nasteski sang Happy Birthday and the crowd of bidders and spectators - some in formal wear, others wearing sports team-colored beanies - gave him three cheers "G'day folks, how're you doing?" Crowe said to the crowd. "Are you having a little bit of fun? It's exciting, isn't it? So it's been a lot of fun putting it together for you."

Immediately afterward, the violin- which Crowe described as "a lot very close to my heart" - became the 31st item to go under the hammer. Before the auction, Sotheby's predicted the eclectic offerings, covering movies, guitars, art, watches, sporting memorabilia and Crowe's jewelry gifts to Spencer,

would bring between AU\$2.6 million and AU\$3.7 million. The official final sum was not immediately available after the auction, which took more than five hours. Bidders' interest had been expected to focus on the violin and paraphernalia from "Gladiator," the 2000 blockbuster that earned Crowe his Academy Award for Best Actor. Demand for movie memorabilia often overwhelmed expectations.

Braddock in the 2005 movie "Cinderella Man," estimated to bring between AU\$500 and AU\$600, sold for AU\$7,000 after intense bidding. — AP

Ex-Saint Laurent designer wins huge payout in contract dispute



Star designer Hedi Slimane has won an 9.3 million euro (\$11.5 Dmillion) settlement from the luxury group Kering in a court judgement which lifts the lid on how much fashion's big names are paid. Court documents seen by AFP Friday show that the "Sultan of skinny", famed for his skinny jeans look, was only paid 667,000 euros of the 10 million he had been promised for his last year in charge of French label Saint Laurent. A spokesperson for Kering told AFP the group was appealing the decision.

Slimane, 49, one of fashion's hottest and most enigmatic talents, went through a messy divorce with Kering, the brand's owners, in 2016. He has since moved to the rival luxury conglomerate, LVMH, to take the reins at Celine, where he will also create a men's line in a massive overhaul of the brand. The latest payout comes two years after a Paris court ordered Kering to pay Slimane \$13 million concerning a non-competition clause in his contract. The group also appealed that ruling. Slimane's skinny and rock star chic looks made millions for both Dior and Saint Laurent, and were much

copied by mass-market brands. Chanel boss Karl Lagerfeld once famously shed 41 kilos (90 pounds) in order to squeeze into Slimane's skinny jeans. Like Lagerfeld, Slimane is a renowned photographer, and he has spent the last seven years living in Los Angeles, where he had moved his studio at the end of his reign at Saint Laurent. The designer drew much of his inspiration from the LA rock scene, which he tirelessly documented with his photographs and in his blog. A mysterious and intensely private figure, he nonetheless has struck up close friendships with many A-listers including pop star Lady Gaga. The Libertines' bohemian frontman Peter Doherty also became a friend and muse, and figured prominently in his 2006 photo book, "London Birth of a Cult". Born into an immigrant family in Paris, Slimane's father was a Tunisian boxer who became an accountant and his mother an Italian dressmaker. — AFP

Gabbana label would die with them. "Once we're dead, we're dead. I don't want a Japanese designer to start designing Dolce & Gabbana," Gabbana, 55, said in an interview with Italian newspaper Corriere della Sera. The veteran fashionistas launched their brand in 1985 and continue to work together despite breaking up as a couple in 2004. "When we split up, we said to ourselves that it was better to divide up everything, because if I took a blow to the head the next day he (Dolce) would have found himself dealing with someone not involved in the industry, like for example my cousin, who could ruin the business," Gabbana said.

"We have created a trust neither of us can touch." Dolce, 59, added that the pair had refused "every offer to buy the brand". "You can have all the money in the world, but if you are not free, what do you do? You don't go to

After decades building up their fashion house, which is famed for its sultry womenswear, Gabbana admits he "doesn't have time" to spend their fortune.


"I'm too busy working. I don't care about becoming richer, my goal is to be successful," he said. In Cambodia, **ears taratur** may go off the menu



hile a plate piled high with hairy, palmsized tarantulas is the stuff of nightmares for some, these garlic fried spiders are a coveted treat in Cambodia, where the only fear is that they may soon vanish due to deforestation and unchecked hunting. Taking a bite out of the plump arachnids has become a popular photo-op for squealing tourists who pass through Skun, the central Cambodian town nicknamed "Spiderville" for its massive market of creepy crawlers. But the bulk of the clientele are locals who are there to load up on a traditional snack known as "aping" that vendors say is becoming scarce-and more expensive-as rapid development wipes out jungle habitats.

Aping are famous in Cambodia but now they are not abundant, they have become rare," Chea Voeun, a tarantula vendor, told AFP from her stall where she sells other fried insects including crickets and scorpions. Voeun, who has been selling the delicacy for 20 years, used to source the spiders from nearby forests, where hunters dug them out of burrows dotting the jungle floor. But those trees have since been razed for cashew nut plantations, forcing Voeun and other vendors to rely on middlemen to procure the spiders, which are harvested from faraway forested provinces. That has jacked up the price of the tarantulas to \$1 a piece, a nearly tenfold spike over the past decade. For now the price surge is helping line the pockets of vendors who can unload several hundred spiders a day, but they fear that stocks are running low and will kill their businesses in the long-term. "When the big forests disappear, these spiders will no longer exist," said seller Lou Srey Sros, as tourists

snapped pictures of children playing with the eightlegged creatures. Locals say the spiders, whose taste has been compared to crab, are best prepared simply: dipped in salt and garlic and then tossed into a pan of sizzling oil.

Surviving famine

Tarantulas have been part of the Cambodian diet for generations, prized for their purported medicinal qualities. But they are believed to have cemented their place on the Cambodian palate during the brutal years under the Khmer Rouge in the late 1970s. The Maoist regime forced millions of Cambodians out of the cities and was ultimately responsible for murdering, overworking and starving to death nearly a quarter of the population in its drive to create an agrarian utopia. Famine pushed many to forage for any sustenance they could find, eating everything from rats to lizards and tarantulas.

While the Khmer Rouge's devastating rule came to an end in 1979, spiders stayed on the menu. But the jungles which are home to them are now rapidly disappearing. Cambodia has one of the fastest deforestation rates in the world, with huge swaths of forest cleared for rubber plantations and timber. The Southeast Asian country has lost 20 percent of its forest cover since 1990, according to the conservation NGO Fauna and Flora International (FFI). It is not just habitat loss but over-harvesting to meet a high demand that is driving the spiders out of existence, said Tom Gray, director of Science and Global Development for Wildlife Alliance.

"Across Southeast Asia it is unsustainable hunting in our forests rather than direct habitat loss which is causing the biggest impacts on biodiversity," he told AFP. The tourist frenzy has helped fuel the tarantula trade, with busloads of travellers stopping in Skun to taste the unusual snack. "It just makes me a little bit swimmy because that was not what I would eat at home but I am here so it's time to try them," Australian tourist Elisabeth Dark said after taking a bite of a spider leg. But for many Cambodians, the only fear factor is that the treat will soon run out. "The next generations may not know about them because these beasts have become so rare, not like before," lamented vendor Lou Srey Sros. "As more people clear (forests) to plant cashew nut trees, they will be gone."-AFP

Huge new Delacroix shows hidden side of 'protean genius'

he first major retrospective of the great French painter Eugene Delacroix in more than half a century in Paris hopes to show that there was far more to the artist than "Liberty Leading the People". His painting of Parisians being led over the barricades by a bare-breasted Liberty during the July Revolution of 1830 is one of the most iconic in art, and was used on the cover of the 2008 Coldplay album, "Viva la Vida". The stirring tableau is also said to have inspired Victor Hugo's masterpiece "Les Miserables", with the boy holding two pistols on the right of the picture said to be the model for the street urchin Gavroche.

But curators who have put together the huge exhibition at the Louvre, which holds the world's largest collection of Delacroix's work, said the bourgeois painter was hardly a revolutionary firebrand. "There is much people do not understand about Delacroix's career," said its co-curator Sebastien Allard. "He does not easily fit into any single movement." He said the show he has put together with his colleague Come Fabre-which will travel to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York in September-attempts to demonstrate the artist's huge range, from large-scale historical subjects to religious and Orientalist themes, and from animal paintings and intimate drawings to still lives of flowers.

Manic diarist

Although his "protean genius set the bar for virtually all other French painters" who followed him, his greatest creative period was actually quite short, Allard noted. Delacroix's most famous and dramatic works-the "Massacre at Chios" (1824), the "Death of Sardanapalus" (1827) and "Liberty Leading the People"-all date from the first decade of his career. Allard said the tension characterizing Delacroix's work reflects that "on the one hand he wanted to be original and the other wanted to fit in with the grand tradition of Flemish and Venetian artists of the 16th and 17th centuries."

Delacroix was also probably the great artist who wrote the most, consigning his innermost thoughts about his work and his private life to a series of diaries. In them we learn of his attraction to the writer Georges Sand and his fears about the progress of the tuberculosis which dogged the latter part of his life. After two decades of only intermittently keeping a diary, he threw himself back into it in 1846 only to lose his entire journal for the momentous year of 1848 - when revolutions shook Europe-in a taxi.—AFP

BARCELONA'S SENEGALESE STREET **VENDORS PRESENT** OWN CLOTHING LINE

enegalese street vendors staged a fashion show Friday in Barcelona to present their own clothing line of "legal clothes made by illegal immigrants", the slogan of their new campaign to get off the streets. Fifteen vendors showed their small collection of T-shirts and sweatshirts, which were created in cooperation with the Design College of Barcelona. A crowd funding campaign collected 48,000 euros (\$59,000) to help set up their new association of Barcelona street vendors and launch the project in June 2017. It aims to find alternative employment for 200 street vendors, who buy the counterfeit clothes they sell from Chinese merchants, according rights platform PlayGround Do, which supports the project.

"We want to show our value to those who do not want to see it. We want to contribute to the economy of Barcelona, which is our city," said a spokesman for the street vendors, Aziz Faye, in a statement. African migrants in Barcelona and other Spanish cities have for years earned a living by selling items in the streets like perfume or hats which they lay on white sheets that they quickly pick up and take away when the police arrive. Last month the death of Senegalese street vendor of cardiac arrest in Madrid reportedly following a police chase thrust the spotlight on their plight and sparked violent clashes in the city. — AFP
