Israel pounds 'Iranian targets' in Syria as F-16 jet shot down

Israel intercepts 'Iranian' drone • Moscow urges 'restraint'

JERUSALEM: Israel struck what it said were Iranian targets inside Syria yesterday in "large-scale" raids after an Israeli warplane crashed under fire from Syrian air defenses in a severe increase in tensions, the military said. The confrontation was the most serious between arch foes Israel and Iran since the civil war in Syria began in 2011. Israel's raids came after it intercepted what it said was an Iranian drone entering its airspace from Syria, which it labeled an "attack".

It was the first time Israel has publicly acknowledged attacking what it identified as Iranian targets in Syria since the conflict started. Iran denounced Israeli "lies" and said Syria had the right to self-defense in response to Israeli strikes. Separately, Iran issued a joint statement with the Syrian regime's other main allies - Russia and Lebanese militant group Hezbollah - denying the allegations regarding the drone.

Russia's foreign ministry called for "restraint" from all parties, adding it was "unacceptable to create threats to the lives and security of Russian soldiers" in Syria.

Israeli military spokesman Jonathan Conricus warned that Syria and Iran were "playing with fire", but stressed his country was not seeking an escalation. "This is the most blatant and severe Iranian violation of Israeli sovereignty in the last years," Conricus told journalists. Israel said its reprisals after the exchange were "large-scale" raids that attacked Syrian air defense systems and Iranian targets. "Twelve targets, including three aerial defense batteries and four Iranian targets that are part of Iran's military establishment in Syria were attacked," a military statement said. Israel has repeatedly warned in recent weeks against the presence of Iranian forces in neighboring Syria.

Emotional Duterte slams treatment of Filipinos in Kuwait

DAVAO: Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte on Friday pledged government help to evacuate Filipinos wanting to leave Kuwait, blasting the state for its "inhuman" treatment of migrant workers after reports of a gruesome killing in the country. An emotional Duterte, who last month banned citizens from travelling to Kuwait to work, said 120 workers had died in the country last year and confirmed the body of one Philippine woman had been found stuffed into a freezer in recent days.

Some 252,000 Filipinos work in Kuwait, many as maids, with reports of widespread abuse and exploitation. But it is unclear how

many would want to return to the Philippines. "When will this inhuman treatment of these Filipino workers end?" Duterte told reporters in his home city of Davao, showing the picture of a woman he said had been "roasted like a pig". "Is there something wrong with your culture? Is there something wrong with your values?" he said, addressing Kuwaitis.

"I implore you, I am making a plea to all Arabs, the Filipino is no slave to anyone, anywhere and everywhere,' Duterte said. "Do not give us back a battered worker or a mutilated corpse." He warned of "drastic measures" to prevent further loss of lives, though he did not say what that would be. "What are you doing to my countrymen? And if I were to do it to your citizens here, would you be happy?" he asked.

He added that the government would ask airlines to send planes to help any Filipino workers in Kuwait wanting to return home to leave within 72 hours. "Those who want to be repatriated, with or without money, I will ask

PAL (Philippine Airlines) and Cebu Pacific to provide the transportation," Duterte said. "I want them out of the country, those who want to go out, in 72 hours. We will count our lives by the hours because apparently every hour there is suffering and agony," Duterte said. He gave no further details.

Duterte has in recent weeks been highly critical of alleged abuse suffered by some of the two million Filipino workers in the Middle East, even threatening a ban on the whole region. The Filipinos in Kuwait are among 10 million nationals working abroad, whose remittances back home are a major pillar of the poverty-stricken nation's economy. "Of course we need the help of Kuwait," Duterte conceded.

Labor Secretary Silvestre Bello said that for Duterte's ban to be lifted, Kuwait must sign a "memorandum of understanding" boosting protection for Filipino workers that

had been pending for three years.

Saudi cleric says abayas not a must as mutawa fade

RIYADH: Saudi women need not wear the abaya - the loose-fitting, full-length robes symbolic of religious faith - a senior member of the top Muslim clerical body said, another indication of the Kingdom's efforts towards modernization. On his television program, Sheikh Abdullah Al-Mutlaq, a member of the Council of Senior Scholars, said Muslim women should dress modestly, but this did not necessitate wearing the abaya. "More than 90 percent of pious Muslim women in the Muslim world do not wear abayas," Sheikh Mutlaq said on Friday. "So we should not force people to wear abayas.'

While not necessarily signalling a change in the law, the statement is the first of its kind from a senior religious figure. It follows the recent pattern of freedoms the Kingdom has been witnessing with the ascent of young Crown Prince Mohammad bin Salman to power. Only the government-appointed clerics associated with the Council of Senior Scholars are allowed to issue fatwas, or Islamic legal opinions. Their interpretations of Islamic law form the basis of Saudi Arabia's legal system.

Sheikh Mutlaq's comment sparked a host of reactions on social media,

including from other clerics who backed his statement. One Saudi Twitter user commented: "Chastity and morality should not be tied to a piece of cloth." Saudi women have started wearing more colorful abayas in recent years, the light blues and pinks in stark contrast with the traditional black. Open abayas over long skirts or jeans are also becoming more common in some parts of the country. The trend marks a major change in the last couple of years. In 2016, a Saudi woman was detained for removing her abaya on a main street in the capital of Riyadh. Local media reported that she was detained after a complaint was filed with the religious police.

Modi first Indian PM to visit W Bank

RAMALLAH: Narendra Modi yesterday became the first Indian prime minister to visit the occupied West Bank where he held talks with Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas as part of a Middle East tour. The visit, which came weeks after Modi hosted Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, was seen as an Indian effort to balance its strengthening ties with the Jewish state. "I have once again assured President Abbas that India is bound by a promise to take care of the Palestinian people's interests," Modi said following a meeting with the Palestinian leader. "India hopes that soon Palestine will become a free country in a page of the paper."

Modi and his entourage had flown in by helicopter from Jordan, landing near Abbas's Ramallah headquarters and laying a wreath at the mausoleum of late Palestinian

Iraq banks on private sector for reconstruction

BAGHDAD: Months after declaring victory over militants, war-battered Iraq hopes to attract billions of dollars from private investors as well as donors to fund its reconstruction. Baghdad is looking to drum up funds at a reconstruction conference in neighboring Kuwait from Feb 12 to 14 after announcing the defeat of the Islamic State group at the end of last year. The country is still reeling from the rise of IS and the punishing fight-back it took to crush the militants, with swathes of its territory in ruins and millions of people displaced.

Authorities in the resource-rich nation say

there has been a heavy toll on oil, electricity and manufacturing infrastructure, as well as basic services such as water and sanitation. Iraq needs to raise \$100 billion to rebuild, Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi has said, after the fight against IS and decades of sanctions and war. "It's a huge amount of money. We know we cannot provide it through our own budget," he said at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland last month. "That's why we now resorted to investment." he said.

Iraq sits on some of the world's largest crude reserves, which Baghdad puts at 153 billion barrels, but the war against IS and a slump in world prices have diminished its oil revenues. The Kuwait conference's second day will be devoted to the private sector's role in rebuilding Iraq, with more than 2,000 companies and businessmen due to attend, according to the Gulf country.

Iraq seeks \$100 billion to reconstruct transport, agriculture and oil sectors

US not planning to contribute money at Iraq reconstruction conferences

BAGHDAD/WASHINGTON: Iraq seeks around \$100 to attract than other sectors given the country's vast billion in foreign investment in transport, energy and agriculture as part of a plan to rebuild parts of the country and revive the economy after a three-year war

The government's National Investment Commission published a list of 157 projects it will seek investment for at an International Conference for Reconstruction of Iraq to be hosted by Kuwait Feb. 12 to 14.

Some of these projects are about rebuilding destroyed facilities like Mosul's airport, while others are new investments to strengthen and diversify the economy away from oil, said an economic advisor to Prime Minister Haider Al-Abadi. "All together, they cost about \$100 billion," the advisor, Mudhar Saleh, said. Sixteen projects carry a price tag of \$500 million or more, according to the list.

Rebuilding homes, hospitals, schools, roads, businesses and telecommunications is key to providing jobs to the young, to end the displacement of hundreds of thousands of people and put an end to several decades of political and sectarian violence.

Iraq declared victory over Islamic State in December, having taken back all the territory captured by the militants in 2014 and 2015. A US-led coalition

supported the Iraqi forces, especially in the battle to dislodge them from Mosul, their de facto capital in northern Iraq, in July.

The United States government will not contribute funds at the conference but will instead encourage investment from the private sector and Gulf Arab allies, US and Western officials said. A US official in

Baghdad said 100 US companies were participating in

Three rail projects top the list: a 500-kilometer (311 mile) line from Baghdad to Basra in the south estimated to cost \$13.7 billion, a line from Baghdad to Mosul in the north estimated at \$8.65 billion and an \$8 billion metro for the capital.

Iraq reopened to foreign investment in 2003 after the US-led invasion that toppled Saddam Hussein, but the vast majority of the billions invested went to increasing its oil and gas production. It has become the second-largest crude exporter of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries, after Saudi Arabia, with a daily output of 4.4 million barrels.

At the conference, Iraq will seek investment in the downstream oil industry including in storage tanks, refineries and petrochemical plants to process its crude into plastics and fertilizers. Saleh said investments in the oil industry and agriculture will probably be easier

crude reserves, available land and water wealth.

Total land offered for investments to grow "strategic crops" is nearly 1,500 square kilometers (580 square miles). Iraq, one of the world's largest wheat importers, aims to achieve self-sufficiency and possibly become a net exporter of the grain. "We feel there will be support for Iraq, from the Americans, the Europeans, the Arab countries, the United Nations, and humanitarian organizations," said Saleh.

Financial contribution

The US does not plan to contribute any money at the conference to fund Iraq's reconstruction drive after the war against Islamic State forces, US and Western officials said, a move critics say could deal a new blow to American standing internationally. "We are not planning to announce anything," a US official said on Thursday regarding financial assistance at the conference, which US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson will attend. The official, however, said Tillerson could still decide closer to the time to announce a contribution.

Washington instead is encouraging private-sector investment and counting on Iraq's Gulf neighbors, particularly Sunni regional heavyweight Saudi Arabia, to

pour in money as part of a rapprochement with Baghdad meant to reduce Shi'ite rival Iran's influence in Iraq.

President Donald Trump said during the 2016 US presidential campaign that if elected, "the era of nationbuilding will be ended."

Asked if the US government will be making an announcement of contributions at the conference, State Department spokeswoman Heather

Nauert said, "I am not aware of any announcements that we will be making." "About 2,300 members of the private sector will also be joining ... and talk about ways that they can help

facilitate the large-scale reconstruction taking place in Iraq," Nauert added. Jeremy Konyndyk, who served from 2013 to 2017 as head of the US Agency for International

Development's (USAID) Office of US Foreign Disaster

Assistance, said that by not contributing to reconstruction, the Trump administration could help set the stage for a new insurgency. "We have seen this movie before. There is a very real risk if the US does not put money into reconstruction, that having just won the battle, you lose the peace," said Konyndyk, now a senior policy fellow at

the Center for Global Development think tank. Another US official pointed to the billions of dollars

the United States has committed to financing loans and restoring basic services to Iraqi towns and cities in the immediate aftermath of fighting. "The immediate stabilization needs remain vast, and limited US government resources alone cannot meet these current and pressing needs, let alone consider supporting long-term reconstruction," the US official said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

The official said Washington strongly supports the conference and would "continue to work with the Government of Iraq and the international community to help address the needs of the Iraqi people as they recover and rebuild their country.'

Fifteen years after

The United States, which invaded Iraq in 2003 and toppled the late President Saddam Hussein and more recently led an international coalition fighting Islamic State, has pumped billions of dollars into Iraq.

In January, the United States said it planned to provide \$150 million for stabilization operations in 2018 funds that would go to restoring basic utilities and grants to small businesses - bringing Washington's total contribution to \$265.3 million since 2015.

The US government has also provided \$1.7 billion in humanitarian assistance for Iraq since 2014, making it the single largest donor to address the Iraqi crisis.

"Absolutely nothing," said a Western official, who requested anonymity because of the sensitivity of the issue, when asked whether Washington would announce any financial contributions at the conference

'Sinews of a strategy'

James Jeffrey, a former US ambassador to Iraq, said the United States had already "poured billions and billions of dollars into Iraq" for the fight against Islamic State, equipping Iraqi forces and humanitarian aid. 'Only the United States can organize the diplomatic, reconstruction, military and political sinews of a strategy for the international community," Jeffrey said. "The fact that we're not putting any money up will weaken our case, and that's unfortunate."

A US official in Baghdad said the American role in the Kuwait conference would be focused on opportunities "for true private-sector investment or public-private partnerships with the Iraqi government.

"What we are trying to do in Kuwait next week is to put together companies that want to look at Iraq ... and possibly also talk about ways to finance projects," added the official, speaking on condition of anonymity.

A State Department official said Washington was counting on other countries to step up, adding that more than 100 US companies would be at the event. Konyndyk, the former USAID official, said business people would want to see the risks of their investments in Iraq mitigated by US government contributions.

"If the US government wants to see private-sector investment go in, they need to put skin in the game,' added Konyndyk, saying a contribution also would demonstrate American commitment to reducing Iran's influence. — Reuters

Kuwait strong, steady regional partner: Tillerson

WASHINGTON: A senior US State Department official affirmed Friday that Kuwait is a "very strong and steady regional partner," and has been a "strong partner" in the anti-IS coalition and a "leader" on humanitarian issues in the region. US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson will travel to Kuwait this week where he will lead the US delegation to the Ministerial meeting of the Global Coalition to Defeat the so-called Islamic State (IS) and participate in the Iraq Reconstruction Conference. The senior official told reporters via teleconference that there are "two main elements" of the anti-IS coalition meeting in Kuwait, noting "we will be focusing on consolidating the gains in Iraq and Syria, a heavy focus on stabilization, and some funding gaps that we hope to close over the course of the next year." The official added that the coalition "also will, importantly, endorse a guiding principles document for what we want to do together over the next year. And that'll focus much more on law enforcement and intelligence sharing, the very difficult work, to make sure that we are catching these people as they cross

On the Iraq reconstruction conference, the official said that the conference will "bring together the donor communities, civil society and the private sector." MoI hacking fails

The interior ministry announced over the weekend that it had stopped an attempt to hack the ministry's website. The department of public relations and security information at the ministry issued a statement confirming that the ministry's webpage has returned to normal and the security authority stopped work for a short period as a precautionary measure. The hacking attempt did not affect the main database of the ministry. Investigations have begun to identify the hacker and prosecute him.

Such incidents wouldn't cause a controversy if they happened to another ministry or a company, but the MoI is a sensitive government body and is connected to the affairs of all people, whether citizens or expatriates. So this incident became a news story until the ministry restored control and everything went back to normal. The seriousness of the incident is due to the fact that MoI retains all personal and private data of everyone and it can't afford or allow any manipulation or tampering with any of its information.

Cyber terrorism is one of the most dangerous types of terrorism today, given the wide scope of the use of modern technology in the world, so it is important to study methods of combating it. Most governments today are subjected to cyber-attacks by so-called hackers. Last year, a group of hackers launched a massive attack on the computer systems of hundreds of private companies around the world-called ransomware attacks - and demanded a digital ransom before returning control. It was said that this attack occurred because of gaps in software, causing extensive damage.

Kuwait is not isolated and we have important entities such as banks and important government bodies such as the interior ministry and the Public Authority for Civil Information, and as long as these places are connected to the Internet, they are undoubtedly exposed to any hacking attempt. Security programs must be fully protected with high-tech systems.

A cyber-attack may try to stop a site from working or change the home page and write a message without any damage to the internal data. But this act is harmful to the reputation of the state and raises fear and anxiety among the people in the community. I am glad that MoI regained control over this important site in record time, and the incident passed peacefully and quickly. But there is a lesson here that MoI must activate the best protection software programs for the future.

Interior Ministry foils bid to hack its website

Fire under control at cultural center

KUWAIT: The Kuwaiti Ministry of Interior (MoI) said on Friday that it has aborted an attempt to hack its website. Concerned security agencies managed to prevent the attempt, but suspended the website for a while just as a precautionary measure in line with a relevant strategy and plan to address such bids, the ministry's public relations department said in a press release.

"The ministry's website was back to normal in a record time, and its electronic systems and official database were not affected at all," it added. Immediate investigations were carried out in order to identify the hacker and bring him to accountability, it noted.

Limited fire

In other news, a limited fire broke out but was put under control at a service room in a restaurant at Jaber Al-Ahmad Cultural Center. The blaze did not cause any human injuries or heavy material damage, Kuwait Fire Service Department (KFSD) said Friday. Firemen evacuated the center of all workers and visitors. After safety and security measures were implemented, the center was back to normal, but the restaurant area remained closed yesterday as a precautionary measure, KFSD noted.

Meanwhile, firemen from Sulaibkhat and Doha stations responded to a call about a fire in a Sulaibkhat house, but they found out that the house contained a warehouse made of corrugated metal covering an area of 1,800 sq m. The

warehouse had large amounts of wood and furniture that were not stored properly, which gave firemen a hard time in battling the blaze. Firemen from the Shuhada and backup stations joined in and bulldozers were used. A fire captain was injured when he fell in a hole. The house had many safety violations, KFSD said. An investigation is underway.


Search for rapist

Ministry requests driving license exemption for muezzins

KUWAIT: The Ministry of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs wrote to the interior ministry to grant expatriate muezzins driving licenses and exempt them from the required conditions to obtain a license, Undersecretary Fareed Emadi said. This request came based on the fact that the number of muezzins employed by the ministry is considered low (around 1,000), Emadi said, adding that the exemption helps make it easy for them to move around, especially those who work in remote areas.

Jurisdiction

A memo was sent to the legal affairs sector at the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor to study the possibility of granting judicial jurisdiction to some charity, foundation, private society and nursery inspectors, Undersecretary for Social Development Sector Affairs Hassan Kazim said. Law 24/1962 regarding clubs and NGOs and law 22/2014 with regards to nurseries authorizes the social affairs ministry to register and supervise NGOs and nurseries, Kazim explained. He said the ministry is seeking to grant employees of these departments judicial jurisdiction so that they can control it and deal with violations mentioned in the law.

Data exchange system
The health ministry renewed its contract to supply

and install a patient data exchange system between paramedics and casualty doctors at hospitals. The estimated cost of the system is KD 2.9 million, according to health ministry sources. They said communication between paramedics and doctors takes place when a critical case being transferred requires medical instructions before reaching the hospital, using the digital communications TETRA systems. It said the major challenges emergency teams face is the high rate of injuries resulting from traffic accidents and heart diseases. The sources said the ministry received 79 new ambulances with advanced specifications that will be commissioned during this month.

Throat cancer

Farwaniya Hospital said 22 new people contract throat and vocal cord cancer in Kuwait, ie 2.9 per 100,000 people, according to statistics by the Kuwait Center for Fighting Cancer that are documented by WHO. ENT consultant Dr Humoud Al-Arrouj was speaking during the announcement about an international conference on the latest medical development with regards to the throat and vocal cords to be held Feb 15-19. Arrouj, who chairs the conference, said such conferences will have a clear effect on developing the healthcare system, contribute to the development of healthcare and train and add to Kuwaiti doctors' experience through following up the latest in this field. He said the scientific committee completed inspection of the papers that are participating in the conference. He said 20 out of the 40 research papers that were selected are on means of diagnosing and treating throat and vocal cord diseases.

Speaker stresses anti-terror coordination

CAIRO: Kuwaiti National Assembly Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanem said yesterday that it is imperative for Arab parliaments to work together to defend Arab issues regionally and internationally. Speaking to reporters following the Third Conference of Arab Parliament and Arab Parliamentary Speakers, Ghanem said an Arab comprehensive document was adopted during the meeting, aiming at fighting extremism and terrorism. translated into concrete steps.

It refuted claims and allegations that the religion of Islam and Muslims have something to do with terrorism, the Kuwaiti parliament speaker emphasized. In this regard, he quoted Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) President Gabriela Barron as stressing during the gathering that Islam is a religion of peace and the IPU rejects any attempt to link between terrorism and Islam. He underlined the significance of periodical meetings among Arab parliaments, noting that coordination would enable everyone to notch up the aspired goals.


UN Palestinian agency faces 'existential crisis'

Kuwait stepped in with \$900,000 contribution

UNITED NATIONS, United States: One month after the until they agree "to come back to the negotiation table" Trump administration announced a drastic funding cut to the UN agency for Palestinian refugees, only one country, Kuwait, has stepped forward to offer additional funding, senior UNRWA officials said Friday.

The United States announced in January that it would

give \$60 million to UNR-WA-a fraction of the more than \$350 million annual contribution that it has previously provided to the agency's budget. Kuwait stepped in to contribute \$900,000 and about 15 donor countries, including Sweden and Japan, decided to speed up their donations to keep UNRWA afloat, said UNRWA's represen-



The United States is the biggest single donor to UNR-WA, which provides schools and health clinics to 5.3 million refugees in the Palestinian territories, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria. Last month, US Ambassador Nikki Haley said the United States would not provide aid to the Palestinians and reach a peace deal with Israel. "The US has not yet explained to us the rationale behind its decision on the \$60 million," Mulrean said, adding that Washington had not presented any concerns about reforms.

WA needed to be reformed, because they consider "any Palestinian as a refugee" and "what they are teaching in schools is not necessarily the right way to have things run." UNRWA has been repeatedly accused of promoting anti-Israel sentiment in schools, a charge it has flatly rejected.

ÚN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres will

attend a ministerial-level donors' conference for UNRWA to be held next month in Geneva to fill the gap in funding, but it remains unclear if the United States will attend. UNRWA's director for the West Bank, Scott Anderson, said all of the agency's services remain up and running for the time being, but that the decision had left many Palestinians anxious. "People are frightened and concerned about what this means for them, their families and their future," he said. —AFP

Kuwait makes it a mission to help post-IS Iraq

KUWAIT: Out of its humanitarian-dimensioned diplomacy, the State of Kuwait made it a mission to extend a helping hand to post-IS Iraq. Since the so-called Islamic State (IS) took over vast areas of Iraq back in 2014, which resulted in an influx of displaced, Kuwait stepped up its aid pace in order to deal with the atrocious situation through its many charity organizations, as well as state bodies. In June 2014, the Kuwaiti cabinet made into a decision to offer urgent humanitarian aid to displaced Iraqis through concerned institutions, either state-operated, NOGs or UN-affiliated. In June 2015, Kuwait announced a \$200 million donation to lessen suffering of the Iraqi people, a step warmly welcomed by the UN, as well as Iraqi Prime Minister Haidar Al-Abadi.

In November 2015, Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) announced the construction of some 500 housing units for the displaced in Iraq's Kurdistan. According to statistics coming from Iraq's Kurdistan back then, there were some 1.5 million relocated in the region, residing in 48 camps. In April 2016, over 1,350 displaced families in the city of Basra, southern Iraq have been recipients of food aid distributed by Kuwait in its ongoing campaign to provide nutritive assistance

The food aid was carried out in coordination between the Kuwait consulate in Basra, KRCS and the Red Crescent Society of Basra. It has benefited 563 displaced families. In July 2016, Kuwait made a total pledge of \$176 million at the Pledging Conference in Support of Iraq in Washington, directing the bulk of the funds toward health and medical facilities.

The announcement was made by Assistant Foreign Minister for Follow Up and Coordination Affairs, Nasser Al-Sabeeh, at the one-day event led by US Secretary of State John Kerry, which aimed to raise more than \$2 billion in new money for Iraqi cities liberated from IS. That goal has been exceeded, and announcements continue to be made. Kuwait co-hosted the conference, along with the US, Canada, Germany, the Netherlands and Japan.

The amount raised was intended for demining; immediate stabilization for communities, including bringing back electricity; expanded stabilization, which would strengthen communities weakened by IS; and humanitarian assistance. In September 2016, the Kuwaitbased International Islamic Charity Organization (IICO)



through the campaign 'we are with you' managed to accumulate over \$1 million in aid for displaced Iraqis in Anbar and Salah Ad'Din provinces. It also funded the construction of eight water treatment station, in addition to providing a fully-equipped mobile clinic and food supplies for displaced families, with a cost of \$1.088 million. In November 2016, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees had received \$8 million from Kuwait to displaced Iraqis, taking the total figure to \$360 million in four years for various humanitarian causes and activities around the world, a generous contribution high appreciated by the UN body

Another UN arm; UNICEF, also received a \$6 million donation the same month, in addition to another \$5 million to the World Health Organization, all to aid their teams and programs in Iraq, especially in Mosul. In January 2017 KRCS announced building five schools and another three medical centers in Irbil and Dohuk for displaced Iraqis' camps in Kurdistan, who fled their homes from Mosul.

As copious amounts of Kuwaiti aid poured into the autonomous region to cope with the influx of displaced people, August 2017 came with Kuwaiti medical aid veighing 55 tons into the war-ravaged Mosul. By that time Kuwait has thus far provided 400 tons of comprehensive medical aid to the northern Iraqi region. In October 2017, Kuwait covered treatment expenses of 180 civilians in the Iraqi city of Mosul who needed artificial limbs. —KUNA





Kuwait pursues relief efforts in disaster-stricken areas

KUWAIT: Living up to its UN-bestowed status as an International Humanitarian Center, Kuwait continued responding to natural and man-made emergencies across the Middle East and beyond last week. On Monday, Feb 5, Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) and Direct Aid Society signed an agreement to support rehabilitation programs for displaced people and refugees in violence stricken

Chairman of Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) Dr Hilal Al-Sayer said that it would serve as a strong partnership to consolidate humanitarian values and goals. Dr Sayer said the accord stipulates holding vocational training programs to develop skills and technical capacity of the poor and improve their stan-dard of living. "It envisages exchange of experience in addition to holding joint media campaigns for activities and projects."

Moreover, it aims to support and rehabilitate displaced persons and refugees in countries affected by natural disasters, backing health programs and activities, erecting

makeshift surgical facilities and hospitals in the most needy areas. Meanwhile, Chairman of Board of Directors of Direct Aid Society, Abdul Rahman Al-Muhailan, hailed cooperation with the KRCS, providing medical aid for the injured during recent events in Somalia. The KRCS is quite effective in responding to crises and emergency situations, he added.

On Wednesday, Feb 7, KRCS and Kuwait Finance House (KFH) co-signed an agreement to build and refurbish orphanages to accommodate parentless Syrian children in Turkey. The deal is a productive effort towards a humanitarian cause, KRCS chairman Dr Sayer said in a statement.

Dr Sayer pointed out that the venerable Kuwaiti charity would continue to pursue altruistic activities all over the world, saying that the private sector has proven to be a trusted partner in such endeavors. The KRCS chief added that a core chunk of aid is earmarked for Syrian refugees, in a bid to lessen the misery they are facing.


On Thursday, Feb 8, KRCS has donated three mobile medical clinics to Iraqi displaced persons in the affected areas of Iraq. Dr Sayer said that the mobile clinics consist of dental, x-ray and laboratory units and two other clinics to examine the patients. Dr Sayer added that the KRCS will continue under the slogan (Kuwait Beside You) to support the displaced Iraqis, pointing out that vehicles would be handed to the Iraqi Medical Association. He explained that these clinics will be distributed immediately in parts of Iraq and the Kurdistan region as such areas are in dire need for these equipment. —KUNA

Death in Afghanistan or bitter life in Pakistan

Islamabad puts Afghan refugees in the crosshairs

PESHAWAR: Death awaits you in Afghanistan, says refugee Mohammad Wali, insisting he prefers to endure a grim existence in a Pakistani camp than return home and be killed. Islamabad has increasingly put Afghan refugees in the crosshairs in recent weeks, claiming that militants hide in Pakistani camps and calling for all refugees to be repatriated as part of a campaign to eliminate extremism. But in Afghanistan, nearly four decades after the Soviet invasion sent the first refugees flowing over the border, the resurgent Taleban fight on, with civilians repeatedly caught in the carnage.

Days after a spate of deadly attacks killed more than 130 people, Wali, wearing a shabby coat, said a recent call to his family in the Afghan capital was filled with only dire news. "They told me of terrible attacks and of the bombers blowing them up and nothing else," the fruit seller said. Pakistan hosts roughly 1.4 million registered Afghan refugees, the UN says. A further 700,000 undocumented are also believed to be living in the country.

Pakistanis have long viewed them suspiciously, with police accused of harassment and extortion along with arbitrary arrests. "Even our caps were taken here (by police)," said Wali. In recent weeks anti-refugee rhetoric by officials has heated up again, notably as they come under increased US pressure over militant safe havens. "Pakistan has also been stressing the need of early repatriation of Afghan refugees as their presence in Pakistan helps Afghan terrorists to melt and morph among them," the foreign ministry said, following a suspected US drone strike in the tribal belt last month.

The official pressure coincides with a souring of public opinion toward refugees, with some Pakistanis saying Afghans have overstaved their welcome. "Enough is

enough, we served them for 40 years, shared our houses and treated them as guests," said Peshawar resident Mehmood Khan. The UN's refugee agency has warned against any forcible or coerced repatriations, insisting they be voluntary. In late January, Pakistan extended a deadline by 60 days for refugees holding proof of registration cards to leave its territory. But as securi-

ty in Afghanistan deteriorates further, refugees at an Islamabad camp said volunteers would be in short supply.

'Nothing left'

Women carried buckets of water on their heads at the camp on the outskirts of Islamabad as young children

played cricket in the dust near mud brick homes that lack electricity and clean water. But none who spoke to AFP wanted to leave, all citing security and work as day laborers. "There is nothing left in my homeland... only war and fighting," said Hajji Shahzada, 60, who came to Pakistan during the Soviet invasion four decades ago. A recent report by the Norwegian

Refugee Council found that seven out of 10 Afghans who had returned after living as refugees abroad have been displaced twice, chased from place to place by the insurgency. The findings should

give nations hosting Afghan refugees pause, said NRC secretary general Ian Egeland. "Now is not the time to deport Afghans... It can destabilize the whole region and lead to

immeasurable suffering," he said in the report. Often the refugees end up in major urban centers such as Kabul, competing for scant resources. Kabul, straining to manage its expanding population and feeble economy, has failed to help them, says Sher Agha, a representative for the refugees in Islamabad. "Providing jobs and employment is another issue, but at the very least they need shelter," he said.

'Better to live'

The conditions are so bleak that "many" returnees are sneaking back across the porous border and quietly taking up their lives in Pakistan, multiple refugees told AFP. Abdul Malik was born an Afghan refugee in northwest Pakistan, living there for more than 40 years. But in 2016 he repatriated with his Pakistani wife and children. They settled in a village near Jalalabad, in eastern Nangarhar province, where the Taleban and the Islamic State group have been waging a turf war. "It was the most unpleasant experience of my life," Malik, wrapped in a traditional Pashtun shawl, told AFP during an interview in Peshawar.

The water was contaminated, the air was polluted, there were no doctors, no clinics, no employment, nothing but "bad roads and difficult conditions", he said-along with the constant fear of a brutal death at the hands of militants. He lasted three months before sneaking back into Pakistan-as many other Afghan families who could afford the journey have done. Wali, who spoke to AFP at the Islamabad camp, said he would rather endure uncertainty in a country that does not want him than return home. "Better to live here even if we face hunger and thirst," he explains. "At least we

Mexico arrests Zetas drug cartel boss wanted in US

MEXICO CITY: Mexican marines have captured a kingpin in the violent Zetas drug cartel who had a \$5-million reward on his head in the United States, authorities said Friday. Jose Maria Guizar Valencia, alias "Z43," was arrested Thursday in the upscale Mexico City neighborhood of La Roma "without the use of force," the head of the National Security Commission, Renato Sales, announced in a press conference.

Guizar, who has dual US-Mexican citizenship, had several warrants out for his arrest in both countries on charges including drug and arms trafficking, organized crime, murder and kidnapping. "He is believed to be responsible for trafficking drugs from South America to the United States, and was one of the main drivers of violence in the states of southeastern Mexico," said Sales.

The US State Department says Guizar launched his own faction of the Zetas group in southeastern Mexico after the killing of the cartel's founder, Heriberto Lazcano, and the arrests of his successors, brothers Miguel Angel Trevino and Omar Trevino. "Guizar Valencia is responsible for the importation of thousands of kilograms of cocaine and methamphetamine to the United States on a yearly basis," says his State Department rap sheet, which puts his age at 38. "The Zetas, under the command of Guizar Valencia, have murdered an untold number of Guatemalan civilians during the systematic overtake of the Guatemalan border region with Mexico." Mexican authorities trace his criminal career back to at least 1998, when he was identified as a mid-level drug trafficker in the western state of Michoacan, said Sales. By 2005 he had extended his operations to three other states, Tamaulipas, Veracruz and Chiapas, recruiting local cartels into his network along the way. Since 2007, he has been the Zetas's point man for smuggling Colombian drugs into the United States via Guatemala and Mexico, and also had connections with suppliers in other countries in Central and South America, Sales said. Sales did not say how the cartel's command structure would now stand.

From soldiers to kingpins

The Zetas are considered one of the most cruel criminal organizations in Mexico, accused of melting enemies in a barrel of "stew," slaughtering 72 migrants in August 2010 and igniting a fire that killed 52 people in a Monterrey casino in 2011. The group, founded by former elite soldiers, was originally the armed enforcer of the Gulf Cartel until the two groups split in 2010, unleashing a wave of violence in northern Mexico. The Zetas have themselves been splintering in recent years, since founder Lazcano was killed in a shootout with navy forces in 2012 and his successors, the Trevino brothers, were arrested-Miguel Angel in 2013 and Omar in 2015. Guizar was on Mexico's list of its 122 most-wanted crime bosses. President Enrique Pena Nieto's government claims to have captured all but a handful of the people on that list since he took office in 2012. —AFP

Indonesia pushes for pre-marital and gay sex ban

JAKARTA: Indonesia is pushing to clamp down on gay and pre-marital sex as part of a sweeping criminal law overhaul that critics blame on a wave of religious fundamentalism sweeping across the world's biggest Muslim-majority nation. The proposed shake up-which also takes aim at condom use and adultery-is winning unprecedented support ahead of 2019 presidential elections, after earlier attempts to shake up Indonesia's Dutch-colonial era laws fizzled. Parliament is drawing up the new code with all the major political parties reportedly on board and the draft is expected to be tabled in the coming months. Wide swathes of Indonesian society-including heterosexual couples who might face jail for having sex outside wedlock or having an affair-may be impacted if the laws pass. But the Southeast Asian nation's small LGBT community could feel the sting most.

"Some politicians see it as an opportunity to cater to the religious base," said political analyst Yuventius Nicky. "There's this supposed morality threat that is being queer." Government officials, religious hardliners and influential Islamic groups have lined up to make anti-LGBT statements in public recently. Last month, Google pulled one of the world's largest gay dating apps from the Indonesian version of its online store in response to government demands.

And police have used a tough anti-pornography law to criminalize members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) community. Parliamentary speaker Bambang Soesatyo called this week for a crackdown on the community's "excesses", after the health ministry announced it would release a medical guide classifying homosexuality as a "mental disorder". Gay sex is currently legal everywhere in secular Indonesia except for Aceh where it is banned under the semiautonomous province's Islamic law.

'Hateful rhetoric'

The UN human rights chief blasted Indonesia's proposed laws and raised them in talks with President Joko Widodo this week. "The hateful rhetoric against this (LGBT) community that is being cultivated seemingly for cynical political purposes will only deepen their suffering and create unnecessary divisions," UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein told reporters. "Any discriminatory provisions (in the new law) need to be removed," he added. The code's latest draft carries a fiveyear jail term for extramarital sex or adultery, fuelling concerns that same-sex couples, who cannot marry in Indonesia, could be caught up in the dragnet. It also carries penalties for "showing or offering contraception tools without authorization" and calls for stiffer blasphemy sentences. Supporters of the changes include the Family Love Alliance, a lobby group which made a failed attempt to get the constitutional court to outlaw extramarital and same-sex relations. "Gay sex is deplorable," Alliance leader Rita Soebagio told AFP. But the new law "does not mean that many people would be arrested. It's just like when the aw on corruption was passed, not everybody was arrested for corruption".

'Alarming trend'

Last month, police in Aceh made global headlines by publicly humiliating a group of transgender women, in the latest challenge to Indonesia's reputation as a bastion of progressiveness and religious tolerance. "If these laws were passed it would give them (police) legitimate reasons or a basis for them to conduct these kinds of raids," said human rights lawyer Ricky Gunawan.

"This is a worrying and alarming trend of persecution against LGBT and other minorities." Hardliners' ultimate goal, some say, is nationwide Islamic law modeled on Aceh, where public flogging is a common punishment for a slew of activities that are legal elsewhere in Indonesia, including pre-marital sex and selling alcohol. 'This is their grand scheme," said LGBT activist Dede Oetomo. The idea is not without public support. A poll last month said nearly 90 percent

of Indonesians felt "threatened" by the LGBT community, while a 2013 Pew survey said 72 percent of Indonesian Muslims supported replacing the secular code with Islamic law.

In a case that highlighted growing links between politics and religion, Jakarta's first Christian leader was jailed on blasphemy charges levelled by supporters of his challenger, who won a come-from-behind race for city governor. Rights groups are now scrambling to muster resistance to the proposed laws with a nearly 57,000 signature petition. Widodo has veto power, but he needs to buoy support among increasingly influential Islamic groups ahead of a 2019 re-election bid. "People in the government are carefully trying to fend that off," said rights lawyer Gunawan. —AFP

Displaced from the Libya 'ghost town,' stranded on desert plain

40,000 residents driven out; ghost town in ruins

QARARAT AL-QATF: On a windswept desert plain, displaced families from a town which sided with Libya's leader Muammar Gaddafi before his ouster in a 2011 revolt have been left in a makeshift camp to rue their bad fortune. A last-minute breakdown in a deal to allow their return has left them stranded, within sight of the palm trees of their home town of Tawergha east of the Libyan capital Tripoli and 40 kilometers from the rival town of Misrata.

Armed groups from Misrata expelled Tawergha's residents after accusing them of fighting alongside Gaddafi's forces when their town came under a relentless siege during the uprising, as well as accusing them of taking part in torture, rapes and murders. Gunmen from Misrata have been blocking the roads

into Tawergha since February 1 when hundreds of Tawergha families rolled up in cars to return home under a deal struck by Libya's unity government and Misrata.

They have also fired warning shots, without causing casualties. "I can't tell you how overjoyed I was when I heard we were going home. We were just at

the entrance to town when they blocked the road." Najat al-Fitouri said, standing outside her tent. She had come back from Tobruk, more than 1,000 kilometers to the east, where she had taken refuge with her seven children in 2011. "I'm not moving. I will stay here even for a year, until I go back," said Fitouri. Like dozens of other families, she has been camped in Qararat al-Qatf, just 20 kilometers from Tawergha, waiting for results from talks between their mayor and the unity government which has been acting as mediator.

'Snakes and scorpions'

With its 40,000 residents driven out, Tawergha has been reduced to a ghost town in ruins. Its would-be returnees in Qararat Al-Qatf are using their cars as shelter or the hundreds of tents distributed by UN aid agencies. Two blue tents serve as dispensaries and four portable bathroom units have been set up. "The situation is miserable," said Daud al-Tuleiha, a former Tawergha town official. "Since 2011, we've become experts of exodus," he said with a wry smile.

We move around with our gas cylinders and even wood" used to keep warm and for cooking in the absence of electricity and running water. "Sometimes we climb up a dune to catch a glimpse of our palm trees," he added. A neighbor in the camp, Mabruk al-Suwissi, aimed his anger at the government. "They've

> left us here without shelter or food for the past week. We need medicine... This desert is crawling with grass snakes and scorpions!" he said. Tawergha's may-Abdelrahman Chakchak, said the return was being held up by elements in Misrata who don't understand that this is not a reconciliation... This is a return deal that could later lead

to a reconciliation".

The mayor was giving a tour to the UN-backed unity administration's local government minister, Badad Qansou, the first official to visit the camp. "I thought the situation was better than this in the camp. We can clearly see families who've been left without shelter," he said, vowing to supply more aid. "We're determined to guarantee a return to Tawergha free of bloodshed. I see your suffering... A bit of patience and everything will be sorted out," the minister said. "Haven't we been patient long enough?" a frustrated onlooker shot back. —AFP

Gerry Adams: Pariah turned peacemaker

DUBLIN: Gerry Adams went from being the political voice of the Irish Republican Army, reviled by the British government and Northern Ireland's Protestants, to playing the peacemaker in bringing the province's Troubles to an end. As he hands over the reins of power of Sinn Fein to Mary Lou McDonald, Adams has more recently become an anti-austerity figurehead and an opponent of Brexit while cultivating an avuncular image on Twitter. It is a far cry from the bloodiest years of the sectarian

conflict in Northern Ireland when he would defend the actions of paramilitaries and his voice was banned from British airwaves.

The bearded leader of the IRA's political wing Sinn Fein was then a hated figure for many Protestants in Northern Ireland during the province's three-decade long Troubles. But he is credited with eventually convincing the IRA to give up their armed campaign to unite Northern Ireland with the Republic of Ireland. More recently he took centre stage after Britain voted for Brexit in 2016, throwing the peace accord into uncertainty with Northern Ireland set to leave the European Union, while the Republic of Ireland remains. The outgoing leader labeled Brexit a "disaster" for the island of Ireland, and is still expected to be an influential voice as Britain and the EU negotiate over the border issue. —AFP



DONETSK: Every day dozens of people in the Ukrainian rebei strongnoid of Donetsk gather on a windswept railroad overpass not far from the frontline, taking the risk of coming under fire. They go to the bridge at a half-abandoned railway station on the outskirts of the city in the hope of catching a signal from cell towers on the other side of the frontline so they can call their family and friends in government-controlled areas.

On a recent afternoon ringtones blared and phones beeped and buzzed as a few dozen people huddled on the old overpass, pressing their handsets against their ears or staring intently at screens as an icy wind blew. "Danger! High voltage," read a warning on metal sheets attached to the sides of the overpass about the proximity of power supply lines. "May God protect you," an elderly woman told someone at the other end of her phone line. Up to two million people in war-torn eastern Ukraine were left without cell phone access after Vodafone-the last major mobile operator in the region-suffered a fibre optic line cut in January.

The outage had all but severed communication between Ukrainians living on opposite sides of the frontline. While mobile phone access was quickly restored in the fellow rebel stronghold of Lugansk, Donetsk residents remain without proper cellular coverage. The bridge at the Rutchenkove railway station about 10 kilometers (six miles) from the frontline is one of a few places on the outskirts of Donetsk where residents can still catch a Vodafone signal, however weak.

'Better than nothing'

Artyom, a 29-year-old businessman, had read about sites where cellular connection with Kiev-controlled areas was available in a local newspaper. "This place is closer to the frontline and we can get the signal from their towers," he told AFP on the bridge. Like others, he declined to give his last name over safety

fears. Passenger trains have stopped passing through Rutchenkove after the outbreak of a conflict between Russian-backed rebels and Ukrainian government forces that has claimed more than 10,000 lives since

Viktoria, who came to the bridge with her husband, said they had no other way of reaching relatives. "This is a necessity," she said. "We have family members in Ukraine we cannot reach any other way, especially old people who do not know how to use the internet," said the 24-year-old, clutching a phone in her cold hands. She added she had to try several times before managing to get a good connection. "In Donetsk there is no connection at all so this bridge is better than nothing."

Some locals use the rare pockets of cell service to access their accounts in Kiev-controlled banks. Elena, a 40-year-old accountant, took a tram to the other side of the city to receive confirmation about a recent money transfer. "Ukrainian phone numbers are linked to bank accounts and without mobile connection we cannot access our money, unfortunately," she said. Vodafone said it had done everything to restore mobile connection. "The most likely reason for the lack of mobile coverage in the Donetsk region is the absence of power supply," the company said in a statement.—AFP

Nashville mayor in hot water after admitting affair

CHICAGO: Until last week, Nashville Mayor Megan Barry was a rising political star. A popular Democrat in deeply conservative Tennessee, Barry is the first female mayor of America's country music capital-a liberal enclave in the southern state. The 54-year-old presided over the city's economic growth, officiated its first same-sex wedding, and advocated for an ambitious \$5 billion mass transit plan. "She was becoming increasingly visible on the national political stage," said political science professor Joshua Clinton, of Nashville's Vanderbilt University. Then, came January 31. Standing alone in front of news cameras, Barry confessed to a two-year extramarital affair with Sergeant Robert Forrest, the city police officer in charge of her personal security. Barry is married. So is the officer. The affair had ended, she said, and both were trying to mend their personal lives. "I am embarrassed and I am sad, and I am so sorry for all the pain that I have caused my family and his family," Barry said.

The revelation was a bombshell. Now Barry is fighting for

her political life amid three official investigations, but has ruled out resigning. Sergeant Forrest retired from the city's police department. In the era of the "MeToo" movement, with powerful men toppled over accusations of harassment or sexual impropriety, there have been questions over whether the mayor's case was a reversal of that now-familiar narrative. Did a powerful woman survive a scandal while her male subordinate did not? Was the police officer's career over by choice?

'Two middle-aged people'

During her news conference, Barry dismissed any parallel with the abuses fuelling the MeToo movement. "This is not about sexually harassing and economically disadvantaging women," she said. "This is a consensual relationship between two middle-aged people who had feelings for each other." The officer has not spoken publicly about why he chose to retire. The gender role reversal-compared to most of the scandals exposed in recent months-may lessen the suspicions that Barry took advantage of her bodyguard.

But Clinton suspects the mayor's gender could affect how the scandal plays out in other ways-exposing her to tougher scrutiny in the affair's aftermath, because she is a woman. "Politicians have obviously survived similar issues in the past," Clinton told AFP. "One issue is whether she is treated differently by voters because of her gender." —AFP





WASHINGTON: A brief US government shutdown ended on Friday after Congress passed and President Donald Trump signed into law a wide-ranging deal expected to push budget deficits into the \$1 trillion-a-year zone. The bill was approved by a wide margin in the Senate and survived a rebellion of 67 conservative Republicans in the House of Representatives thanks to the support of some Democrats. Those conservatives were mainly angry about non-military spending increases.

Trump's signature brought an end to a partial govern-

ment shutdown, or closure of federal agencies, that had been triggered in the early hours of Friday as Congress was still debating the budget deal. It was the second shutdown this year under the Republican-controlled Congress and Trump, who played little role in attempts by party leaders this week to end months of fiscal squabbling. In a Twitter post that acknowledged the misgivings of fiscal conservatives,



Trump also wrote that negotiations will "start now!" on an immigration measure that he and Democrats have been battling over for months. The deal, the fifth temporary funding measure for the fiscal year that began Oct 1, replenishes federal coffers until March 23, giving lawmakers more time to write a full-year budget. It also extends the US government's borrowing authority until March 2019, sparing Washington politicians difficult votes on debt and deficits until after mid-term congressional elections in November.

Deficit splurge

The Republican Party was once known for fiscal conservatism, but congressional Republicans and Trump are now quickly expanding the US budget deficit and its \$20

trillion national debt. Their sweeping tax overhaul bill approved in December will add an estimated \$1.5 trillion to the national debt over 10 years. Nearly \$300 billion in new spending included in the bill approved on Friday will mean the annual budget deficit will exceed \$1 trillion in 2019, said the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, a private fiscal policy watchdog group. Friday's deal allows for \$165 billion in additional defense spending over two years, helping Trump deliver on his promise to boost the military.

That won over many Republicans, but some were furious over the \$131 billion extra allocated for non-military spending, including health and infrastructure. The White House will amend its upcoming budget request to take into account the higher spending levels in the deal that passed into law on Friday, a senior official in the Office of

Management and Budget said. The White House budget proposal, to be released on Monday, projects that the economy will grow about 3 percent over the next decade, with a slightly larger near-term boost of 3.2 percent next year before declining to 3 percent in 2021 and 2.8 percent n 2026, the Wall Street Journal reported.

Compared with last year, the administration projects lower inflation over the coming decade and lower government borrowing expenses, the Journal reported. The forecast assumes the 10-year Treasury yield will average 2.6 percent this year and 3.1 percent next year before rising to 7 percent by early next decade, the newspaper reported. None of the added spending in the newly approved budget will be offset by budget savings elsewhere or revenue increases, relying instead on government borrowing. There also is no offset reduction for nearly \$90 billion in new disaster aid for US states and territories ravaged by hurricanes or wildfires last year.

Stock market swings

The brief shutdown came at a sensitive time for finan-

cial markets, with world stock markets diving in the past week. Markets barely flinched at the last shutdown in January, but that was before a selloff that started on Jan. 30 amid concerns about inflation and higher interest rates. Wall Street's main stock indexes climbed more than 1 percent on Friday, giving investors some solace after a week of huge swings that shook the market out of months of calm. Republican Senator Rand Paul, objecting to deficit spending in the bill, launched a ninehour, on-again, off-again protest and floor speech late on Thursday that delayed passage of the deal past midnight, when funding for the government ran out. He had

harsh words for his own party. "Now we have Republicans hand in hand with Democrats offering us trillion-dollar deficits," Paul said. "I can't ... in good faith, just look the other way because my party is now complicit in the deficits. Really who is to blame? Both parties." House Democratic leader Nancy Pelosi and others in her party had opposed the bill because Republican House leaders would not guarantee her a debate later on bipartisan steps to protect about 700,000 "Dreamer" immigrants from deportation. These young adults were brought illegally to the country as children, mostly from Mexico. —Reuters

News in brief

Scores defy Thai junta

BANGKOK: Scores of Thais yesterday gathered in defiance of a junta ban on protests to call for a return to democracy, as public anger mounts over prolonged military repression. The ruling junta has kept a tight lid on dissent since its 2014 coup by outlawing gatherings of more than five people and ramping up use of a draconian royal defamation law. But impatience with the generals has been building in recent weeks and breaking through the surface in a series of creative and increasingly bold protests. The agitation has been fuelled by a spate of graft scandals, including one that has ensnared the junta's No 2, plus the postponement of elections the regime had promised for November 2018. —AFP

19 die; bus topples over

HONG KONG: At least 19 people were killed and dozens injured when a double-decker bus toppled over in Hong Kong yesterday evening, police said. Photographs on local media websites showed the bus lying on its side with its roof torn off by a road near the town of Tai Po in the northern New Territories. Rescuers were attempting to reach passengers trapped in the wreckage, although police were unable to say how many were still inside the bus. The dead included 17 males and two females, police said. It was not immediately known what caused the accident. —AFP

Navy seizes crystal meth

BATAM: Indonesia's navy seized more than a ton of crystal methamphetamine and arrested four people in a major drug bust this week, a top navy official said yesterday. A navy boat patrolling the Phillip Channel between Singapore and Batam intercepted the MV Sunrise Glory, which was flying the Singapore flag, as it entered Indonesian waters. Officials suspected it might actually be a Taiwanese fishing boat which has been targeted by the Indonesian military since December for being a part of a drug syndicate, navy deputy chief Vice Admiral Achmad Taufiqoerrochman told a press conference. The boat was flying the Singapore flag but changed it for the Indonesian one as the navy patrol approached. —AFP

Taiwan quake toll rises

TAIPEI: The toll from a deadly 6.4-magnitude quake in Taiwan rose to 14 yesterday as rescuers searching for a missing family of Chinese tourists discovered two more bodies in a partially toppled building. Scores of rescuers combed the rubble at the foot of the 12-storey Yun Tsui apartment block that was left leaning at around a 50degree angle by the quake, complicating rescue efforts due to fears of an imminent collapse. The two bodies and the last three missing are believed to be members of a family from Beijing who arrived in Taiwan Monday, authorities said. — AFP

2 Indian soldiers killed

SRINAGAR: Two Indian soldiers were killed yesterday in an ongoing gunfight after suspected militants attacked a military base in the Jammu region of Indian-administered Kashmir, officials said. The pre-dawn attack left six others injured, including a girl, after heavily armed militants stormed Sunjuwan Army camp near Jammu, the second largest city in the disputed Himalayan region close to the border with Pakistan. "Two Junior Commissioned Officers (JCOs) have been killed and six others injured in Jammu militant attack," a senior minister Abdul Rehman Veeri told lawmakers inside the state's parliament. —AFP

Shannon Watts and Dana Loesch, faces of gun control debate

WASHINGTON: Each time there's another mass shooting in the United States, Shannon Watts and Dana Loesch take to Twitter on opposite ends of the gun debate. Watts, founder of Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, makes the arguments for stricter gun control in a country with 33,000 gun-related deaths a year. Loesch, spokeswoman for the National Rifle Association (NRA) and a conservative radio host, lays out the case for why

Americans need weapons for self-defense. The two women have become among the most prominent public faces of the gun control debate with hundreds of thousands of followers across the United States. Local elections can be won or lost on a word from either one of the well-connected activists. They are masters of social media, even going so far as to "troll" each other, mostly on their Twitter feeds but also sometimes even in person. In a video on YouTube, Loesch can be seen confronting Watts at a rally asking her "Do you claim to speak for all Moms or just Moms who


are for gun control?" Watts brushes her off and walks away, saying she does not want to engage with Loesch because she has been "so insulting to me online."

Watts has dismissed Loesch on Twitter as a "paid NRA shill" and accused her of using "racist, bigoted and violent rhetoric." Loesch has repeatedly struck back at Watts on her own Twitter account, @DLoesch, which has more than 700,000 followers and where she touts her devotion to God, family and guns. Tattoed on her forearm is "Ephesians," a reference to the New Testament verse urging Christians to don the "armor of God" to fight evil.

'Hands Off My Gun'

"I'm a Mom," the 39-year-old Loesch says in an ad for the NRA. "And just like millions of other women that's why I own guns. "We're responsible, we're law-abiding and we're everything that makes America strong," she says. The cover of her book "Hands Off My Gun: Defeating the Plot to Disarm America" features Loesch in a tight red dress and high heels holding a rifle. Last month, Loesch interviewed Vice President Mike Pence for her nationally syndicated radio program, "The Dana Show."

"I'm a fan," Pence told her. "Thanks for your great voice all across America." Watts, who is in her mid 40s, was a public relations executive for Fortune 500 companies before putting her career aside to raise five children in Indiana. Her life changed on December 14, 2012. That was

the day when 20 children aged six and seven years old were shot dead by a mentally unbalanced young man at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut. Spurred to take action, Watts started a Facebook page and her crusade against gun violence has snowballed since then, earning her the nickname the

Five years later, her Moms Demand

Action page on Facebook has more than 560,000 followers and her Twitter account @shannonrwatts more than 115,000. "Moms Demand Action For Gun Sense In America" now claims to have chapters in all 50 states. Its members, clad in trademark red T-shirts, are regularly seen at city hall and outside state legislatures putting pressure on lawmakers. —AFP

S African political deadlock as Zuma clings to power

JOHANNESBURG: South Africa's political impasse deepened yesterday with no resolution to extended talks over President Jacob Zuma's expected departure from office after his own party called for him to resign. Cyril Ramaphosa, the president-in-waiting, and the ruling ANC party have said negotiations should be concluded within days, but have given no details about how Zuma will be eased out of power.

The stalemate has left South Africa's political scene in limbo, with a series of public events cancelled this week including the flagship State of the Nation address to parliament in Cape Town on Thursday. Zuma cleared his diary of weekend engagements, but deputy president Ramaphosa is due to speak at a rally in the city on Sunday to start a year of celebrations marking 100 years since Nelson Mandela's birth.

February 11 also marks the day that Mandela was released from jail in 1990 a key date in modern South Africa's re-birth as apartheid white-minority rule crumbled. Zuma and Ramaphosa will "conclude" discussions on Zuma's exit within 48 hours and the outcome will then be announced to the nation, the News24 website said vesterday without naming its sources. But Susan Booysen, a politics professor from Wits University in Johannesburg, said Zuma may fight on for several more days. "A stalemate is the best description for the situation," she said. "Zuma is a fighter to the end and is refusing to resign, while Ramaphosa doesn't want to be divisive. "Zuma pretended to open the doors of negotiations, but he is digging in."

Corruption scandals

Local media reported that a key sticking point in talks was over legal fees faced by Zuma, who is set for prolonged court battles related to multiple criminal cases. On Friday,



the president reportedly flew back from Cape Town to his official residence in Pretoria. The ANC has said it is awaiting the "imminent conclusion" of the talks, and said the budget on February 21 will not be delayed. Ramaphosa has made no official comment since Wednesday when he described the discussions as "constructive" towards securing "a speedy resolution of the matter." Zuma has made no comment since being asked to resign by senior ANC officials last Sunday. The pro-Zuma New Age newspaper reported Friday that the president would gather his family at his residence in Pretoria this weekend to inform them of his decision.

Zuma's wife Thobeka Madiba-Zuma posted a picture of the couple on Instagram on Friday, adding a defiant comment that warned against "picking a fight with someone who is not fighting you". Zuma, 75, who has been in office since 2009, has clung to power despite a string of corruption scandals, an economic slowdown and record unemployment. His hold on the ANC was shaken when his chosen successor-his former wife Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma-narrowly lost out to Ramaphosa in a closely-fought race to be party leader in December. Zuma faces several court cases, including action relating to 783 payments he allegedly received linked to an arms deal before he came to power. —AFP

2nd White House aide resigns over 'domestic abuse'

WASHINGTON: A second White House staffer in a week resigned Friday over domestic abuse claims, in a widening scandal that called into question the president's judgment and tainted his chief of staff John Kelly and longtime aide Hope Hicks. Hours after Trump's comments about staff secretary Rob Porter, a White House speechwriter, David Sorensen, resigned after his wife said he was abusive, claims he denies. Porter-who also denies abuse alleged by two exwives, one of whom released a photo of herself with a black eye-worked at the heart of the White House throughout the first year of Trump's administration, despite being denied a full security clearance. He only stepped down from his post Wednesday after the accusations became public.

Trump, who has himself been accused of sexual harassment or assault by two dozen women, fueled the scandal by praising Porter and suggesting he had a bright future. He made no mention of the ex-wives or the alleged domestic abuse. "We certainly wish him well, and it's a tough time for him," Trump said in the Oval Office. GANGNEUNG: North Korean leader Kim Jong Un invited the South's President Moon Jae-in for a summit in Pyongyang yesterday, Seoul said, even as the US warned against falling for Pyongyang's Olympic charm offensive. The invitation, delivered by Kim's visiting sister Kim Yo Jong, said Kim was willing to meet the South's leader "at the earliest date possible", said a spokesman for the presidential Blue House.

An inter-Korean summit would be the third of its kind, after Kim's father and predecessor Kim Jong II met the South's Kim Dae-jung and Roh Moo-hyun in 2000 and 2007 respectively, both of them in Pyongyang. Moon did not immediately accept the invitation. Washington insists that Pyongyang-which is under multiple sets of UN Security Council sanctions-must take concrete steps towards denuclearization before any negotiations can happen. After months of

"We hope to see you in Pyongyang at an early date," Kim Yo Jong told Moon after delivering a personal letter from her brother, according to officials. "We want to see President Moon become a protagonist in opening a new chapter for reunification and leave great footprints in history," she said.

Diplomatic quandary

The two Koreas have been divided since the conflict ended in a ceasefire in 1953, and the democratic South has risen to become the world's 11th-largest economy, while the North has stagnated under the Kim family's rule. The offer could put Moon in a delicate diplomatic quandary, but he avoided a direct response, said his spokesman Kim Eui-kyeom, and called instead for efforts to "create the right conditions" for a visit. Moon urged Pyongyang to actively seek an "absolutely necessary" dialogue with Washington, he said. Tensions between the two soared last year as Pyongyang launched intercontinental ballistic missiles capable of reaching the US mainland and carried out by far its most powerful nuclear test to date.

Analysts believe the Olympic diplomatic drive by the North-which put its ICBMs on show at a military parade in Pyongyang on Thursday-seeks to loosen the sanctions against it and undermine the alliance between Seoul and Washington. They expressed skepticism on the prospects for a summit, with professor Koh Yu-hwan of

Dongguk University not expecting one "in the fore-seeable future." "Kim's proposal for a summit with Moon is based on the premise that the North will stick to its nuclear weapons while seeking rapprochement with the South," he said. "The North is not interested in talks on denuclearization."

Kimchi and soju

The North Korean delegation then took the bullet train to Gangneung, the venue of all ice competitions, and attended a banquet hosted by the South's unification minister Cho Myong-gyon. "Although it's my first time here, it doesn't feel strange. It's not unfamiliar," Kim said when asked by one of the South Koreans at the dinner how she feels on the other side of the border. The North Koreans and



Moon are reportedly due to watch the Koreas' unified women's ice hockey team's first match against Switzerland later. Moon shook hands with both Kim Yo Jong and Kim Yong Nam at the Olympics opening ceremony on Friday and they cheered as athletes from North and South entered the arena together behind a unification flag showing an undivided Korean peninsula.

But US Vice President Mike Pence, who was seated in the same box at the opening ceremony, did not interact with the North Koreans at any point, US officials said. He did not shake hands with Kim Yong Nam while making a brief appearance at a leaders' reception ahead of the ceremony-although Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe did so. "The US will not

allow the propaganda charade by the North Korean regime to go unchallenged on the world stage," Pence tweeted yesterday.

"The world can NOT turn a blind eye to the oppression & threats of the Kim regime." In stark contrast, two kinds of kimchi-the fermented cabbage that features in every Korean meal-were on the menu for the delegation's lunch with Moon at the Blue House yesterday, one mild Northern style version and a spicier Southern recipe, along with soju, the traditional Korean rice liquor. The smiles and handshakes were friendlier than some of the North's past history with the complex-in 1968 Pyongyang sent commandos to attack it to try to assassinate the South's then leader.—AFP

A recipe for disasters ahead

omestic American politics have become so cripplingly partisan that Congress can't pass a long-term spending bill or deal the critical issues like immigration reform, comprehensive health care reform, or provide the massive funding needed to repair our crumbling infrastructure. Due to this deep and bitter divide - fueled, in part, by: The president's inflammatory tweets; the harsh and inflammatory rhetoric from pundits; and the media's penchant to create feeding frenzies over "gotcha" scandalous news stories -Washington has turned decidedly inward and disturbingly dysfunctional.

Focused more on fighting for the sake of fighting and scoring points against political opponents, too little attention is paid to America's role in the rest of the world. The only times that Congress will attend to international matters is when there is, at stake, a domestic political advantage in appeasing supporters or striking out at rivals. As a result, there will be Congressional debates on punishing groups that support boycotting Israel, imposing sanctions on Iran or Russia, Russia's meddling in our elections, or building a wall between the US and Mexico. But scant attention is given to addressing the US role in critical conflict areas from Somalia and Yemen, to Syria, Iraq, and

This reality came into sharp focus, a few days back, at an event hosted by my Institute. It was our 20th annual Congressional dinner. This has long been one of my favorite affairs since it's a small gathering that brings together the Arab American Members of Congress, the Arab Ambassadors to the US, and a select number of members of our Board, many of whom have rich political experience. It is, by design, an intimate, private, and offthe-record dinner providing the attendees with an opportunity to "let down their hair" and have a frank and open conversation about critical issues facing the US-Arab relationship.

This year's dinner discussion, however, was different and the difference was illustrative of the serious problems plaguing American politics and the impact that this is having on the ability of our country to meaningfully engage in the world. Despite the presence of some Arab ambassadors whose countries are facing serious internal and regional challenges and whose situations are directly impacted by US policies, and despite the eloquent presentations made by these ambassadors, our discussions kept returning to our dysfunctional partisan divide.

National dilemma

To their credit, our Congressional representatives and other participants, some of whom were senior political figures with long and distinguished careers in both the Democratic and Republican parties, never descended into rancor or fingerpointing. The concerns they raised were heartfelt and thoughtful. They lamented the demise of the political parties, which one participant described as once having played the role of mediating institutions that engaged and provided meaningful access to their members, but now served mainly as fundraising vehicles.

The once important role played by the parties had now been eclipsed by billionaire donors and their well-funded agenda-driven political action committees. Our participants also decried the transformation of cable television from conveyors of news into partisan entertainment vehicles that, instead of informing the public, now served to inflame and polarize political discourse. And they expressed growing concern with the inability of Congress and some political leaders to engage in civil and productive discourse, making it increasingly impossible to reach compromise on critical issues facing the nation.

The discussion was thoughtful and quite instructive, but despite repeated efforts to refocus participants on the US role in the Arab World, we kept drifting back to our preoccupation with our politics at home. And so, issues - like: The needs of Syrian refugees and the destabilizing impact they are having on host countries; the humanitarian crisis in Yemen; the deteriorating situation in the occupied Palestinian lands; and the potential for an expanding US military role in Syria, without a

strategic vision - received too little attention. I left the dinner feeling that it had been a reflection of our national dilemma, in microcosm. Our hyper-partisan dysfunction has caused America to turn inward and, as a result, Congress has abdicated its oversight role and our political leaders have left the American public uninformed about the dangers afoot in the world and unprepared to deal with the challenges we face in countries in which we are deeply engaged. And that's a recipe for disaster.

Rich Communist offers 'strawberry' socialism

debonair businessman who boasts million-dollar earnings, Pavel Grudinin is a surprise choice as Russia's Communist candidate for president. Nicknamed the "strawberry king," the 57-year-old has a pick-your-own fruit farm and dairy herd on a chunk of valuable real estate on Moscow's outskirts. With luxuriant curly grey hair, moustache and a ready smile, he is the first fresh face in years to stand for the red-flag-waving party led by 73-year-old stalwart Gennady Zyuganov.

In a predictable March 18 presidential election, Grudinin will likely be runner-up to President Vladimir Putin, though he lags far behind in state-run opinion polls at around seven percent. He appears to have all the credentials for a Communist candidate: he runs an agribusiness named after Vladimir Lenin and has praised Stalin, to whom he bears a passing resemblance. Yet he is not a member of the Communist party and has criticized its "dogmas".

Much of his wealth comes from renting and selling highly valuable land bordering the Moscow ring road to reportedly four billion rubles (\$69 million). "My earnings over the last six years were 157 million (rubles, \$2.7 million). I don't earn badly," he told reporters. Analysts see his role in the Kremlin scenario as boosting turnout - but not taking votes away from Putin. Grudinin is willing to criticize policies but not the strongman himself. "This is not a battle between people, it's a battle of ideologies." he said. In the past he publicly supported Putin and even joined the ruling party.

Lasers zapping udders

Communist leader Zyuganov has praised Grudinin for enacting socialist principles, from building a turreted Disney-style kindergarten to paying workers above-average wages. Zyuganov calls it a "territory of social optimism". The Sovkhoz Imeni Lenina, or Lenin State Farm, covers a whole district, entered through elaborate gates decorated with strawberry motifs. Inside are strawberry sculptures, a cafe called Berry and streetlights in the shape

The farm was founded in 1918 as a showcase for Soviet agriculture. In 1995, it became a limited company with Grudinin as director. Journalists on a recent tour were shown how he has modernized the operation, with lasers zapping cows' udders in an automated Dutch milking parlor. Profits are ploughed back into community facilities



that look much better than state-provided ones.

At the school that opened last year, children study computer modelling and Ancient Greek democracy while the spotless kindergarten has a whole room of Lego. Grudinin may be a "capitalist", but his treatment of workers and the local community play well with Communists too, said political analyst Konstantin Kalachev. Communist MP Valery Rashkin insisted there was "no schism" in the party over Grudinin's candidacy, calling him "our man, flesh of our flesh".

Negative stuff and dirt Grudinin is a "dark horse" and the only candidate who

could do better than the Kremlin intends, analyst Andrei Kolesnikov from the Carnegie Moscow Center told Vedomosti business daily. According to state pollster VTsIOM, Grudinin's support stood at more than seven percent in January before dipping to 6.9 percent this month. By comparison, for early February Putin was more than two percentage points lower than at the start of the year when he garnered 73.8 percent.

This prompted a wave of hostile coverage in pro-Kremlin media, questioning Grudinin's integrity and highlighting his foreign bank accounts, supporters say. "It's going badly," said MP Rashkin, complaining that "everyone has turned on Grudinin and they're chucking negative stuff and dirt at him". He said this came after Grudinin's rise in popularity "prompted fear and dismay in Putin's campaign office". He suggested Grudinin could get 30 percent and force Putin into a second round-a scenario the Kremlin wants to avoid at all costs.

Heavy artillery

The use of "the state's heavy artillery", including television, points to the involvement of Putin's minders, wrote journalist Oleg Kashin. Grudinin has complained of checks by tax inspectors and limited airtime. "We're always under pressure," he said. For analyst Kalachev, the media campaign reflects Kremlin fears Grudinin could perform well, particularly with women voters. Grudinin could also win some anti-Putin protest votes, he added, with top opposition leader Alexei Navalny barred from standing and urging a boycott of the election. Like Navalny, Grudinin has wooed young people. He recently gave an interview to popular video blogger Yury Dud that has been viewed more than three million times. The Kremlin is torn over Grudinin, said Kalachev. "On the one hand, they need a good turnout and Grudinin can bring new voters to the polls. On the other hand, if he bites off any of Putin's share, they'll have to scupper him."—AFP

Trump 'energy dominance' policy pits Washington against Moscow

ast July, US President Donald Trump stood beside his Polish counterpart, Andrzej Duda, in Warsaw and lacktrel promised to help wean the nation off Russian energy imports. He offered US fuel as an alternative, "so that you can never be held hostage to a single supplier." Trump was tapping into longstanding European concerns about Russia's ability to shut off natural gas supplies - which it has done in past pricing disputes. US lawmakers say Russia's influence over energy has proven effective in silencing critics of its human rights abuses, annexation of Crimea, and incursion into eastern Ukraine, an assertion the Kremlin has denied.

Six months after Trump's trip, Poland has contracted for imports of US liquefied natural gas (LNG), crude oil, and coal, and announced it will not renew a gas supply deal with Russia's state-owned Gazprom when it expires in 2022 - halting an exclusive and troubled relationship dating to 1944. The episode exemplifies a key goal of Trump's "energy dominance" agenda - using rising energy exports to bolster Washington's geopolitical influence.

The policy also seeks to boost domestic production through rollbacks of environmental regulations and expanded energy leasing in federal territories, but those efforts have so far had little impact. Trump nonetheless inherited a booming oil and gas industry that has given his administration more international clout in energy markets than any White House has enjoyed in decades. US oil output has risen to more than 10 million barrels per day for the first time since 1970 thanks to improved drilling technology that dates back years. Natural gas output has also soared, making America the world's top producer of the fuel.

Meanwhile, the 2015 repeal of a 40-year-old ban on crude oil exports - passed by a Republican-controlled Congress and signed by former President Barack Obama has made strategic shipments overseas possible. The permitting of US LNG export facilities in recent years has

provided another boost. It remains to be seen how successfully the administration will play its strong hand. Obstacles include environmental opposition to new pipelines and other energy projects at home, competition from other big exporters abroad, and potential trade disputes. But early signs are promising. Lithuania, Ukraine, China, Japan, South Korea and Vietnam are among the more than 30 countries that have recently cut US energy supply deals over the past two years - many for the first time.

Buying less from OPEC, selling more to china

John McCarrick, the deputy assistant secretary at the State Department's Bureau of Energy Resources, said his staff helped pave the way for some of the energy supply agreements by meeting with private and public officials in Europe and Asia to promote the strategic value of US energy. "All we're trying to do is level the market playing field," by giving allies the ability to diversify their energy supply, he said. Doing so, he said, could reduce the influence of "market distorting actors," including Russia and producers in the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

The administration also hopes to use energy exports to reduce yawning trade deficits with partners - particularly with China, which last year exported goods to the United States worth \$347 billion more than it imported. China has become a top customer of US LNG and is now the second-largest buyer of US crude behind Canada. China's state oil company signed a preliminary agreement in November to invest in a \$43 billion LNG export facility in Alaska, which would compete with Russia's Yamal LNG export terminal in the Arctic.

"To see collaboration rather than being at each other's throats - that's a real positive," said Daniel Yergin, an energy historian and vice chairman of IHS Markit. US coal exports to Asia have also risen in recent months as ailing US mining companies search for alternatives to the weak domestic market. While US exports are soaring, its imports are falling - reducing its economic and political dependence on oilproducing nations in the Middle East and elsewhere.

Since 2005, US net petroleum imports have plunged to just 4 million barrels per day, from 12.5 million bpd, with the share coming from OPEC falling to about a third from more than half. The now-repealed US oil export ban dated back to an era of feared fuel shortages after Arab members of OPEC imposed an embargo against the United States in retaliation for US support of the Israeli military.

Waking the bear

Trump's National Security Strategy document, unveiled in December, said one aim of the "energy dominance" policv was to "help our allies and partners become more resilient against those that use energy to coerce". Former Soviet bloc nation Lithuania received its first cargo of US LNG in August - an event Lithuania's foreign affairs minister called "crucially important for the whole region."

The Trump administration also helped negotiate a deal in July between Ukraine and US miner Xcoal Energy for some 700,000 tons of coal, and provided hundreds of millions of dollars in financing and insurance to gas and wind power projects there. Ukraine has borne the brunt of Russia's near-monopoly of gas supplies to Europe over the years. State energy company Gazprom has cut off gas to Ukraine, and onward to Western Europe, during price disputes in deep winter, and imposed bans on customers reselling gas to other countries.

The Kremlin and Gazprom have said those disputes were driven by commercial, not political, matters. Gazprom's deputy CEO Alexander Medvedev downplayed the impact of US energy shipments on the region. "I would compare Gazprom's gas exports to Europe with a cup of tea and US supplies to a few drops of cognac or whiskey added to that cup," he told investors in London on Thursday. "You get a bit of smell but there is no major taste."

Russia aims to solidify business ties in Western Europe with a proposed gas pipeline under the Baltic Sea to Germany - the Nord Stream 2. US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said in Warsaw on Jan. 27 that Washington views the project as a threat to Europe's energy security. In addition, Russia may have enough spare capacity to threaten US drilling companies with a price war if American policy irks the country enough, analysts say.

"Down the road, Russia could show the world just how much energy it has to produce, to the detriment... of rival US oil and gas producers," said Amy Myers Jaffe, a senior fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations. Past price wars with OPEC nations have triggered bankruptcies in the United States, including in 2014 when Saudi Arabia opened the spigots. But OPEC eventually relented as oil prices tanked, trimming output and paving the way for a US recovery. Even if the United States struggles to win market share in its competition with cheaper piped gas from Russia, the availability of an alternative will blunt the impact if Russia cuts supplies off again, and reduce its ability to dictate long-term restrictive contracts with its customers, analysts said. —Reuters

IMF chief urges Arab states to slash spending

DUBAI: IMF chief Christine Lagarde yesterday urged Arab countries to slash public wages and subsidies in order to rein in spending, achieve sustainable growth and create jobs. Speaking at the one-day Arab Fiscal Forum in Dubai, Lagarde welcomed "promising" reforms adopted by some Arab countries, but insisted much more was needed to overcome daunting economic and social problems.

Low oil prices are weighing on the finances of Arab oil

exporters, while importers are battling with rising debt, unemployment, conflicts, terrorism and refugee inflows, the International Monetary Fund's managing director said. Almost all Arab countries have posted budget deficits over the past few years and Arab economies grew at just 1.9 percent last year, half the global rate, according to the Arab Monetary Fund (AMF), which co-organized the event with

Yet Arab public spending remains very high, especially in oil-rich Gulf states, where government expenditures exceed 55 percent of gross domestic product, Lagarde said. She said many Arab governments had taken steps to contain spending, but the measures have often been temporary. Public spending reforms should focus on cutting costly subsidies and public wage bills whilst boosting efficiency in areas like health, education and public investment, she said. — AFP

It has teamed up with the US Chamber of Commerce to organize a delegation of over 150 American companies to travel to Kuwait" for the conference. Iraq - the second largest producer within OPEC after Saudi Arabia - has

Kuwait is setting aside its past differences with Iraq to host the summit. In Aug 1990, Iraq invaded Kuwait after accusing its neighbor of "stealing" Iraqi oil from a field straddling the border. Iraqis have since weathered international sanctions, a US-led invasion in 2003 and the battle against IS. Satellite imagery shows some 26,000 houses are destroyed or seriously damaged, including more than 17,000 in the militants' former bastion of Mosul.

The two Israeli crew of the crashed F16 were alive, although one was severely wounded, the military said. Israel's military said the confrontation began with the drone entering its airspace before being intercepted by a combat helicopter. Conricus said it was intercepted well inside Israel over the city of Beit Shean, near the border with Jordan. He did not say whether the drone was armed or for reconnaissance, but alleged it "was on a military mission sent by Iranian military forces" from an "Iranian base" in the Palmyra area.

Eight Israeli aircraft then "targeted the Iranian control systems in Syria that sent the UAV" and confirmed tary presence in Syria and produce weapons against hits, Conricus said. He said the aircraft met "massive Syrian anti-air fire", and the F16 later crashed in northern Israel's Jezreel valley.

Conricus said the jet probably crashed as a result of the anti-aircraft fire. According to the military, the pilots ejected, landed in Israel and were taken to hospital. It said the bases are used by both Iranian and Russian military personnel deployed in support of the regime. Syrian state media said the later raids targeted military positions in the south. Iranian foreign ministry spokesman Bahram Ghasemi said that "to cover their crimes in the region, Israeli officials are resorting to lies against other countries". He said "Iran does not have a military presence in

"There is huge destruction and a huge need to mobilize support," said Erfan Ali, Iraq representative of the UN Human Settlements Program. Ali said there are big hopes the private sector will play a major role in rebuilding, offering "innovative solutions" to tackle the country's problems. "If we do not start to invest in children's education today, this generation will be lost and will not be able to contribute to the economy and the security of Iraq when they grow up." — AFP

Iran, Russia and Hezbollah - the Syrian regime's main allies - issued a statement calling Israel's drone allegations "lies". It said Israel's strikes had targeted drones used against "terrorist organizations", mainly the Islamic State group. The statement vowed a "relentless response" to "all further aggression". Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu met officials including Defense Minister Avigdor Lieberman and military Chief of Staff Gadi Eisenkot later yesterday.

He has held a series of talks in recent months with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Iran's influence in Svria and Lebanon. Netanyahu has been seeking to persuade Russia to limit Iran's presence near Israel and to stop it from entrenching itself militarily in Syria. In Moscow last month, Netanyahu reiterated concerns over what he called attempts by Iran to establish a mili-Israel there. "We won't accept either of those, and will act according to our needs," he said.

Israel remains technically at war with Syria and occupies a swathe of the strategic Golan Heights that it seized in the Six-Day War of 1967 and later annexed in a move never recognized by the international community. On Tuesday, Netanyahu took members of his security cabinet for a tour of the Israeli-occupied side, where they were briefed by the military. Israel has sought to avoid direct involvement in the Syrian war, but acknowledges carrying out dozens of air strikes there to stop what it calls advanced arms deliveries to Hezbollah.

Analysts said they did not expect a further escalation for now, but suggested the heavy anti-aircraft fire showed Syria was more emboldened to stop Israel's strikes. Ofer Zalzberg of the International Crisis Group said Russia should mediate since "it is the only stakeholder which has strong relations with all sides today". But he said "this incident signals a new phase in a way of the war in Syria". — Agencies

leader Yasser Arafat. New Delhi has long backed the Palestinian territories' quest for nationhood and Modi has voiced support for an independent state existing peacefully alongside Israel. After a bilateral meeting, Abbas gave the Indian leader a medal "in recognition of his wise leadership" and "efforts to promote the historic relations between the State of Palestine and the Republic of India".

Speaking alongside Modi, Abbas said they had discussed "bringing the political process out of the deadlock due to the continued Israeli occupation of our land and the political impasse following (US President Donald) Trump's decision on Jerusalem and the refugees". Trump in December shocked the Palestinians by breaking with decades of US policy and recognizing Jerusalem as Israel's capital. The US president is also withholding tens of millions of dollars from UNRWA, the UN agency for Palestinian refugees.

The kingdom has seen an expansion in women's rights recently, such as the decision passed to allow women to attend mixed public sporting events and the announcement that Saudi Arabia would grant them the right to drive. These are some of the many changes the country has undergone in recent months, hailed as proof of a new progressive trend in the deeply conservative Muslim kingdom. But despite these changes, the gender-segregated nation is criticized for its continued constraints on women. Activists have blasted the country's guardianship system which requires a male family member to grant permission for a woman to study abroad, travel and other activities.

Meanwhile, a veiled Saudi woman and an unrelated man jig and twirl on a busy street, stirring a furious debate about the waning influence of the once-feared religious police, notorious for enforcing sex segregation. For decades the "mutawa", as they are known, wielded unbridled powers as arbiters of morality, patrolling streets and malls to snare women wearing bright nail polish and chastise men seeking contact with the opposite sex.

In recent years, Saudi Arabia launched a series of reforms, including gradually diminishing the mutawa's powers to arrest. Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman has further cut back the political role of hardline clerics in a historic reordering of the Saudi state. The brief video of the street dance - no minor infraction in a society steeped in conservatism - roiled public opinion as it surfaced this week, prompting calls for the couple to be arrested.

Authorities pledged swift action amid raging commentary on social media, which laid bare the resentment in conservative quarters over the mutawa's diminishing presence and the uncertainty over their future role. "Where are the religious police?" was a popular refrain among angry Saudi social media users, with some also asking "Why are they silent?" and "Does their silence mean approval?" The mutawa, who fall under a government agency known as the Committee for the Promotion of Virtue and the Prevention of Vice, did not respond to AFP's repeated requests for comment.

The mutawa's declining presence has also been met with relief from many of the country's young. Tearing down partitions dividing the genders, many restaurants in Riyadh are now seen humming with music and mixed-gender crowds, a scene unimaginable until two years ago. One segregated cafe was seen taking down their partitions as soon as patrolling mutawa, dressed in white robes and red-checkered headscarves, left the area.

"We count on India's role as an international force of great prestige and weight," Abbas said, noting "its rising power at the strategic and economic levels" that could "contribute to the achievement of a just peace in our region". The Indian leader said his country "hopes for peace and stability in this region". "We believe a permanent solution to Palestine is possible through dialogue. Only diplomacy and farsightedness can break the cycle of violence and free it from the baggage of the past," Modi said. "India and Palestine's historic relations have stood the test of time. Palestinian interests have always got our support and remained at the top in our foreign policy.

Modi became the first Indian prime minister ever to visit Israel in July last year, with the two states signing deals on cybersecurity and energy. India's refusal to back US moves to recognize Jerusalem as Israel's capital disappointed the Jewish state but was consistent with its support for the Palestinians. Modi later took off for Jordan for the rest of his three-day tour, which will also take him to Oman and the United Arab Emirates. The Gulf is a critical region for New Delhi. India sources more than half its oil and energy supplies from the region, and around nine million Indians live and work there, sending home billions of dollars in remittances annually. — AFP

In recent weeks, columnists in Saudi newspapers such as the prominent pro-government Okaz have openly, and some would say daringly, called for the mutawa to be abolished, arguing that they are an unnecessary financial burden. Their decline comes as 32-year-old Prince Mohammed - himself a millennial in a country where half the population is under 25 pursues a liberalization drive that has upended years of conservative tradition.

He has lifted bans on women driving and cinemas and introduced an array of entertainment and sporting options, sidelining the kingdom's archconservatives, once the traditional backers of the royal family. Opposition to the prince's reforms has been muted - at least publicly - after his crackdown on dissent, including arrests of prominent clerics with millions of followers on social media. High-profile clerics who made regular appearances on television have disappeared from the public eye, and prominent Sheikh Aaidh Al-Qarni recently declared to have "divorced" himself from politics.

Self-styled religious scholars recently appeared on Saudi TV shows advocating against shutting down businesses during prayer time, an idea once anathema in the kingdom. "The influence of conservative clerics has always been exaggerated," Hesham Alghannam, a Saudi researcher at Britain's University of Exeter, told AFP. "Girls' sports, cinemas, concerts or even the disbanding of religious police are not things they can prevent from happening. The kingdom is able to push through such reforms without expecting a backlash."

Still, there is a delicate balance between social liberalization and alienating conservatives, and authorities appear careful not to antagonize religious sensitivities. "There is a difference between moderate Islam and no Islam at all," said a Riyadh-based businessman, requesting anonymity. "Aside from upholding public morals, the mutawa also went after drug dealers and criminals harassing the public."

Uncertainty looms over their future as it remains unclear what the government will do with them. "They can't just disband them and throw them in the street," James Dorsey, a fellow at Singapore's S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies, told AFP. "The best bet is to integrate them into general law enforcement." Fanatical elements within the religious police could be "very dangerous if unemployed and angry, posing a substantial threat," said Bruce Riedel, author of a book on Saudi Arabia titled "Kings and Presidents".

Meanwhile, the mutawa appear to be undergoing an image makeover, with training sessions instructing them to be "gentle and kind" and approach the public with pleasantries such as "my dear brother". But even without the right to arrest, the religious police are not entirely powerless. They now typically work in tandem with the security services and are expected to report violations to civil police.

Over the years, videos of their excesses have proliferated, most notoriously in a fatal incident in 2002, when they were accused of blocking the doors of a burning school as the schoolgirls were not properly veiled. — Agencies

Serena Williams ready for comeback after year of 'ups and downs'

Williams boasts a strong Fed Cup record, with 13-0 singles mark

NASHEVILLE: Serena Williams has spoken out about the "ups and downs" she faced during her year away from competitive tennis but insists she's now focused and ready for her quest to once more dominate her sport. Speaking ahead of her comeback at the Fed Cup in Asheville, North Carolina, where the United States will begin the defence of its crown against an unfancied Netherlands team, the 36-year-old said she had the benefit of a new outlook following the birth of her baby daughter Alexis Olympia in September. "There's been a lot of ups and downs in the practice," Williams told reporters Friday. "Ît also gives me another view, it's almost relaxing for me as I have nothing to prove. Again, just fighting against all odds to be out there again, to be competing again."

Some of that struggle was apparent during an exhibition match in Abu Dhabi in December, where she lost to French Open Champion Jelena Ostapenko. Williams was beaten in straight sets and appeared a little slow on her feet, even as she played some fine shots. She had initially targeted last month's Australian Open crown for a defence of her 2017 crown, but abandoned that goal after declaring she was not "where I personally want to be."

Perhaps wary of setting another ambitious target, Williams refused to be drawn on whether she had set her sights on the

year's remaining Grand Slams-the French Open, Wimbledon and US Open.

EASING IN

For now, she appears to be easing her way in and was not named as the United States' first or second singles player in a powerful US team that includes elder sister Venus, world number 17 CoCo Vandeweghe and world number 62 Lauren Davis.

"Roger Federer is a really great tennis player," Williams said of the Swiss great.

"I don't know any tennis player that has not been inspired by him. I definitely have. Yeah, just trekking on, we keep doing the same thing."While Williams is bidding to emulate Margaret Court, Evonne Goolagong and Kim Clijsters in winning a Grand Slam title after having a child, she acknowledged the path had not been



straightforward and credited her sister with making it possible.

"I have a great partner and relationship with Venus. She's been really, really positive," she said. "There's moments that have just been hard, getting back out there doing it every day. You have to get used to that, get in the rhythm of that." Also credited for a newfound sense of zen was her family life with baby Alexis and husband Alexis Ohanian, the co-founder of Reddit whom she wed in November.

"It's probably been the most fun of my life," she said. And though she insists she has nothing left to prove, one professional goal eludes her-Margaret Court's all-time record for Slam singles titles of 24.

"It goes unsaid 25 is obviously something that I would love, but I'd hate to limit myself," she joked. — AFP

Meesawat produced seven birdies and two bogeys to move into a position to notch his first European Tour win, which would secure his card on that tour. His best previous result on the European Tour was a playoff loss to Miguel Angel Jimenez and Stuart Manley in Hong Kong in 2013. Although he said he believed his last experience of matchplay was at least a decade ago, the 33-year-old was excited by the opportunity to participate in the final day. — AFP

Top-ranked Johnson shares **Pebble Beach** Pro-Am lead

SAN FRANCISCO: World number one Dustin Johnson fired eight birdies in a seven-under par 64 on Friday to grab a share of the second-round lead alongside rookie Beau Hossler at the Pebble Beach National Pro-Am.

Johnson, playing on the par-71 Monterey Peninsula course, one of three in use for the tournament, had just one bogey as he gained ground on overnight co-leader Hossler.

Hossler, who played the par-72 Spyglass Hill, had five birdies in a five-under 67 that put him on 12under as well. The leading duo were two strokes in front of Julian Suri, who carded a four-under 67 at Monterey Peninsula to get to 10-under and Troy Merritt, who shot a five-under 67 at Spyglass Hill.

Johnson, who opened the year with a victory at

the Tournament of Champions in Hawaii last month, teed off on the 10th hole at Monterey Peninsula and birdied his first three holes. He followed his lone bogey of the day with back-to-back birdies at 16 and 17, and picked up three more birdies coming in.

"Kind of the same as yesterday," Johnson said. "I just felt like I played really solid, hit a lot of really good shots, hit a lot of good putts and it was a pretty easy day." Johnson said he's approaching the form that saw him win three straight tournaments early last year before he fell on some stairs and hurt his back as he prepared to tee it up in the Masters.

"The game's really close," Johnson said. "I don't know if it's quite as good as it was during that stretch. That was probably some of the best golf I've played in my career, but parts of the game are just as good." Five-time major-winner Phil Mickelson, a four-time winner in the tournament that teams amateurs from the world of big business, sports and celebrity with the pros, put himself in the mix for the weekend with a bogey-free 65 at Monterey Peninsula that left him tied for fifth on nine-under par.

"I am having fun," said the 47-year-old American, who is seeking a 43rd US PGA Tour title and his first since the 2013 British Open. He hit nine of 13 fairways and 15 of 18 greens in regulation but said he expected a tougher challenge when he plays the par-72 Pebble Beach Golf Links on Saturday.

"I think Pebble's a little bit tougher because the greens are a little firmer and smaller," he said "But if you play well, you can birdie and score low on all

World number two Jon Rahm of Spain had five birdies without a bogey in his five-under par 67 at Pebble Beach on Friday. That put him alongside Mickelson in the group of six players sharing fifth place on nine-under, which also included former world number one Jason Day who posted a sixunder 65 at Monterey Peninsula.

Northern Ireland star Rory McIlroy, playing the tournament for the first time, was five-under for the tournament through 13 holes of the second round when disaster struck at Monterey Peninsula's driveable par-four fifth-his 14th hole of the day.

He nearly drove the green and putted his eagle attempt to within 10 feet. But he needed four more putts from there, recording a double-bogey on the hole. Joint Olympic team makes history for two Koreas

Lim's gold gives S Korea first Pyeongchang medal

GANGNEUNG: North and South Korea competed together for the first time at an Olympics yesterday as the first of 102 gold medals were decided against a fast-moving backdrop of diplomatic manoeuvring. Kim Yo Jong, the powerful sister of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un, was among a high-level delegation in the stands as the joint Korean women's ice hockey team took on Switzerland in their opening match.

The Games have triggered rapid reconciliation between the two Koreas, who are still technically at war. In talks yesterday, South Korean President Moon Jae-in was invited to a summit with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un. There was joy for South Korea when short-track speed skater Lim Hyo-jun won the first gold for hosts on day one, claiming the men's 1500m in front of a near-capacity crowd.

Earlier, Sweden's Charlotte Kalla won the first title of the Games in the women's skiathlon, followed by Germany's Laura Dahlmeier who triumphed in the women's 7.5km sprint biathlon. Five gold medals were up for grabs on day one, concluding with Kamil Stoch's attempt to become the first back-to-back ski jumping champion in the normal hill.

But most South Korean fans were fixated on the ice hockey, where the combined North and South women's team appeared at a packed Kwandong Hockey Centre.

The two Koreas marched together at Friday's opening ceremony but they have never before competed side-by-side at an Olympics. Among the crowd was a large number of North Korea's all-female "Army of Beauties" cheer squad, known for their

tightly choreographed moves and chants.
At a Games rife with political overtones,
US Vice-President Mike Pence was watching nearby as the first North Korean athlete
competed-and flopped-yesterday. North
Korean cheerleaders let rip in support for

Choe Un Song but he was eliminated in the heats for the 1,500m short-track speed skating, failing to reach the semi-finals.

INTERNET SHUTDOWN

Earlier, Kalla won the skiathlon race ahead of Norway's Marit Bjoergen, preventing her from collecting an unprecedented third straight gold medal in the event. But Bjoergen still became the most

decorated woman in Winter Olympics history as she claimed her 11th medal. Third came Finland's Krista Parmakoski.

In biathlon, Germany's Dahlmeier took the honours in the women's 7.5km sprint ahead of Norway's Marte Olsbu and Veronika Vitkova of the Czech Republic. Carlijn Achtereekte made her Olympic debut a golden one, leading a Dutch podium sweep in the women's 3,000-metre speed skating.

Ireen Wust, the 2006 and 2014 champion, was a narrow second with Antoinette de Jong third. Elsewhere, organisers probed a mysterious shutdown

Jamaican bobsledder in tears over Olympic journey

PYEONGCHANG: Jamaica's Jazmine Fenlator-Victorian broke down in tears yesterday as she described the journey that has led her to the Pyeongchang Olympics as part of a trailblazing bobsled team. Fenlator-Victorian, who has switched to Jamaica after representing the United States at Sochi 2014, welled up and struggled to talk when she oke of the importance of being a role model for black children. "It's important to me that little girls and little boys see someone that looks like them, talks like them, has the same culture as them, has crazy curly hair and wears it natural, has brown skin, included in different things in this world," said an emotional Fenlator-Victorian.

"When you grow up and you don't see that, you feel like you can't do it. And that's not right. So coming home to Jamaica, I wanted my Jamaican people to see that they can do it, that there's not just one path to get out of poverty and make a name for themselves."

Thirty years after the famous "Cool Runnings" Jamaican men's bobsleigh team competed at Calgary 1988, the women's team are the country's first female Winter Olympians. Nigeria's Seun Adigun, who will be joined by Akuoma Omeoga on the South Korean ice, is another former American who is taking bobsled to new audiences. Fenlator-Victorian and Adigun both left the US bobsled program for their own longshot efforts that have paid off in extra attention this month at Pyeongchang. "To start your own federation as well is really impressive," said US bobsled-der Lauren Gibbs.

US women came to bobsled from other sports such as athletics, volleyball and softball and see the empowerment and diversity impact it can make. "I call it the hidden gem of women's sports," says pilot Jamie Greubel Poser. "It's cool for all of us to see the sport grow in places where it wasn't on the radar. We want to spread the word so more women can have the opportunity." Aja Evans, who backstops Poser, ended her athletics career and jumped into bobsled. "The skills from other sports transition well to bobsled," she said. "It's all about power, speed, explosiveness at the start. A lot of collegiate women are ready for bobsled and they don't know about it." Evans applauds the chance bobsled offers to women in surprising places.

"Diversity is great," Evans said. "Now you have Jamaican and Nigerian athletes coming in. The world is finally catching up and realising the potential all across the board. It's amazing to be a part of that."—AFP

Dutch medal sweep in women's 3,000m speedskating

GANGNEUNG: Garlijn Achtereekte made her Olympic debut a golden one, leading a Dutch podium sweep in the women's 3,000-metre speed skating yesterday at the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics.

The 28-year-old skated in the fifth of 12 heats, well before the favourites, but her dazzling time of 3:59.21 held up to win. Ireen Wust, the 2006 and 2014 champion, was a narrow second in 3:59.29 with Antoinette de Jong third in 4:00.02.

Achtereekte was third at the Dutch Olympic trials and second in last month's European championships in 4:06.81, but was a shock winner when it matter most. Wust took her ninth Olympic speed skating medal, matching the all-time record total of Germany's Claudia Pechstein and tying the Dutch career record for Olympic medals by equestrian rider Anky Van Grunsven.

But it was another near-miss for Wust, a four-time Olympic champion who also settled for second in the 1,000, 1,500 and 5,000 at Sochi in 2014. Wust missed out on becoming the first Dutch woman to defend a Winter Olympic title and only the second woman with back-to-back golds in the event.

Wust also narrowly failed to become the first Dutch athlete to win five Olympic golds in the Winter or Summer Games. Czech Martina Sablikova, the 2010 Olympic champion and silver medallist at Sochi, was fourth, just 0.52 behind de Jong, with Japan's Miho Takagi fifth in 4:01.35.

Pechstein, a record nine-time Olympic speedskating medallist who turns 46 later this month, missed her chance to win a medal at a sixth different Winter Olympics, finishing ninth in 4:04.49.

Italy's Francesca Lollobrigida, the great-niece of famed 1950s actress Gina Lolobrigida, finished 13th in 4:08.58. — AFP

Klammer bets on Feuz to win 'turny' downhill

PYEONGCHANG: Austrian great Franz Klammer says the winner of the men's downhill in Pyeongchang will be the skier who hits every turn right and makes the fewest mistakes- and he thinks that will be Switzerland's Beat Feuz.

"He's really strong, he's my favourite but also the Austrians are quite good, so if everything goes right we will make a medal, definitely," said the 1976 Olympic champion, whose name is still synonymous with the glamour and danger of Alpine ski racing.

He also rates the chances of his countryman Matthias Mayer winning a second successive downhill goldalthough with one important caveat. "His prospects are very good. I liked him in training. He was loose, he was good. But he always makes some mistakes, so when he can avoid mistakes he will be up there and he could defend his title," Klammer told Reuters in an interview on the eve of the Olympic race.

No man has won back-to-back Olympic downhill golds and the Austrian said conditions here would suit Mayer less than they did four years ago. "The downhill in Sochi was very, very good for him because it was steep, it was rough and at that time he was the best in those conditions. Here it's easier, it's more grinding, you don't have the advantage when you have guts and when you really attack it. So you have to be smooth and still let it run."

The route to victory, he said, would be "not making mistakes, not missing a gate, not missing a turn. The key is to hit every turn right". In his pomp, Klammer was renowned for the fearless abandon with which he flew down the slopes. At 64, he still cuts an imposing, silver-haired figure, resplendent in green lederhosen and bright red socks at the Austria House where the Alpine nation makes its Olympic hangout.

It is clear he is nostalgic for the old days of ski racing, and the relatively benign course at the Jeongseon Alpine Centre, designed by his old racing rival Bernhard Russi of Switzerland, is not to his taste.

"In my opinion it's too turny. But that's how they make downhill courses nowadays-it's one turn after another, one turn after another. For my taste I would like to have some schuss and then make a turn, have downhills like they used to be."

He laughs when asked if there is any skier in the field who reminds him of his younger self. "I think Aksel Lund Svindal. He's set up for speed so he barely makes the turns but he's always very, very fast, so I like his way of skiing."

At 35, can the Norwegian win? "Of course he can win, he's one of the favourites. So let's say there's one favourite out there like Feuz and then there's Svindal, (Kjetil) Jansrud, Mayer, maybe (Christof) Innerhofer, I don't know. So there are many out there for medals, but we'll see." — Reuters

MELBOURNE: Australia cruised to a seven-wicket victory over England with more than five overs to spare to remain unbeaten after three games in the triangular Twenty20 series in Melbourne yesterday. The Australians restricted England to 137 for seven off their 20 overs with paceman Kane Richardson taking three wickets and then the home team knocked up the runs

A match-winning partnership of 65 between Glenn Maxwell (39) and D'Arcy Short (36 not out), plus cameos from Chris Lynn (31) and Aaron Finch (20 not out from five balls), got Australia comfortably home. The win ensured Australia will play in the tri-series final in Auckland on February 21 with preliminary matches now switching to New Zealand. The game-defining sequence came when Maxwell and Short accelerated



the score from 65 for two at the end of the ninth over to 104 for two after the 11th, 39 runs flowing over just two overs. "Our players have been in tremendous form coming off the Big Bash League and they are playing with freedom and they're playing fearless," Australia skipper David Warner said.

"The bowlers executed their game beautifully and the way the batters finished it off was absolutely clinical."But Warner's form is again in the spotlight after his relentless playing schedule. This time he lasted just four balls, nicking a David Willey outswinger on two. Warner is the only member of the Test side to have played for Australia in every format this summer and



has struggled for form in the ODIs and T20s. He is expected to travel with the T20 side to New Zealand before heading straight to South Africa for the first of

It was a second drubbing for England after going down by five wickets to Australia in Hobart on Wednesday. "It was another poor performance for us," stand-in captain Jos Buttler said. "We didn't quite soak up the pressure early on with the bat losing early wickets to back it up for the end and none of us kicked on. "Again the power of Australia proved too much."

Buttler was deputising for injured skipper Eoin Morgan, who missed the match after straining his right

groin during training on Friday. Pacemen Kane Richardson and Billy Stanlake claimed five wickets between them after Australia was sent into bat.

England were reeling at 34 for three in the fourth over when David Warner ran out Dawid Malan with a brilliant direct hit. James Vince was skittled by a slower ball from Andrew Tye before Buttler (46) and Sam Billings (29) steadied the ship.

Billings struck the only six of England's innings when he smashed Ashton Agar over long on in the 14th over, but he fell to Stanlake with Warner taking the first of two catches at mid-off. Stanlake (2-28) and Richardson (3-33) did the damage for Australia. — AFP

China face Indonesia in Asia Team final

KUALA LUMPUR: Badminton powerhouse China stormed into the Asia Team Championship final where they will face Indonesia after they defeated Malaysia 3-1 in the semifinals yesterday. Since China and Malaysia qualified for the Thomas Cup Finals after their respective victories in the quarter finals Friday, they rested their senior players and allowed their young shuttlers to gain some international exposure. The Thomas Cup Finals is one the world's most prestigious badminton events in terms of player and fan

The semi-finalists in this tournament automatically qualify for this year's Thomas Cup, to be held in Thailand's capital Bangkok in May. World number two Lee Chong Wei of Malaysia did not play in the semifinals as the team's goal in the tournament was to book a ticket for the Thomas Cup. The veteran Lee was replaced by Lee Zii Jia.

US soccer elects vice-president Cordeiro as new chief

ORLANDO: United States Soccer Federation vice-president Carlos Cordeiro was elected chief of the governing body yesterday, replacing outgoing president Sunil Gulati who stepped down after the country's 2018 World Cup flop. Cordeiro, a Harvard-educated former investment banker, came through a crowded field of eight contenders to win on a third ballot at the USSF's annual meeting at the Seaworld resort in Orlando.

Cordeiro romped home in the third round of voting with 68.6 percent of the ballot, crushing sports marketing executive Kathy Carter, who was second with 10.6 percent. The 61-year-old Cordeiro, along with Carter, was widely seen as an establishment candidate by other contenders in the field, who had demanded sweeping changes to the USSF following the country's shock failure to reach this summer's World Cup in Russia. "Thank you to those of you who have supported me today," said Cordeiro, who will begin a four-year term. "This is incredibly humbling. To those of you who didn't vote for me, I'm going to work to earn your support and trust over the next four years. "I promise I will work for all of you to bring us together as one soccer community."

Cordeiro's election drew a line under the first contested election for the USSF presidency since 1998. Other candidates included former US internationals Paul Caligiuri, Kyle Martino and Eric Wynalda, as well as women's international

goalkeeper Hope Solo. Boston attorney Steve Gans and Michael Winograd completed the field.

Martino, Wynalda and Solo had mounted slick campaigns vowing to provide a fresh outlook to US soccer after the World Cup flop, which they blamed on a systemic failure to uncover and nurture young talent. However none managed to mount a serious challenge to Cordeiro when voting began, with Martino posting 10.6 percent in the final ballot, Wynalda 8.9 percent and Solo 1.4 percent.

Cordeiro, an Indian-born Colombian citizen who lives in Miami, won 36 percent in the first ballot, with Carter just two points adrift. Carter had been seen as a marginal front-runner on the eve of the election. Her critics claimed her closeness to Major League Soccer-she heads the company which markets the league-was a negative. Cordeiro's previous roles with US Soccer had also come under scrutiny although he stressed his initial role as an independent advisor which started 10 years ago-he became Vice President in 2016 — meant he was very much his own man.

Most of the rhetoric in the lead-up to the most contentious election in US Soccer history zoned in on an innate failure at grassroots to produce the kind of players which would help to build on a dream of winning the World Cup, potentially at home, in 2026. "The Federation has lost its way and forgotten about the need to develop the sport for all. I cannot stand back and watch it any longer," said Solo, who has accused US Soccer of neglecting the women's game and launched legal action last month. "There are two establishment candidates (Carter and Cordeiro) who will give you more of the same. They are a vote for the status quo-more failure." Soccer is the most expensive sport for children to play-some US Soccer-affiliated teams charge \$4,000 per season to play for them-leaving talented youngsters priced out. — AFP

Cutrone scores double as Milan hit four past SPAL

MILAN: Patrick Cutrone hit a double with Lucas Biglia and Fabio Borini also scoring as AC Milan crushed SPAL 4-0 yesterday to boost their European ambitions.

The 20-year-old Cutrone took centre stage with Nikola Kalinic injured and Davide Calabria suspended, opening after two minutes in Ferrara off a rebound and doubling from close range on 65 minutes.

doubling from close range on 65 minutes.

Argentine Biglia got his first Milan goal on 73 minutes with a curler into the bottom corner, following an error from SPAL keeper Alex Meret.

And Borini came off the bench and quickly found the fourth from a tight angle to give Milan a fourth win in their last five Serie A games. Gennaro Gattuso's side move up to seventh, still just outside the Europa League places. "We knew it would be a difficult game and in fact, immediately after scoring, we suffered," said Italy forward Cutrone. "We did well to resist and like a great team find a way to kill off the game."

The result has also improved Milan's slim Champions League hopes, with city rivals Inter Milan, seven points ahead in the final spot for elite European action next season, hosting Bologna on Sunday.

"The Champions League? We have to focus on one game at a time and the next one is an Europa League game next Thursday. We want to move forward in Europe," said Cutrone.—AFP

Wade wins in return, Clippers contain Griffin

LOS ANGELES: Lou Williams scored a team-high 26 points as the Los Angeles Clippers defeated the Detroit Pistons 108-95, spoiling Blake Griffin's bid to beat his former team on Friday night. Montrezl Harrell came off the bench to score 18 points and DeAndre Jordan added 17 rebounds as the visiting Clippers snapped the Pistons' five-game winning streak. "With the style Doc (coach Rivers) has put into place, we got some pretty solid pieces and we have shown that in the last few games. So far so good," said Williams.

One longitime piece was missing for the Clippers but it

One longtime piece was missing for the Clippers, but it didn't matter. They dealt Griffin to Detroit last month and Friday was his first opportunity to get even, but instead it turned into his first loss. Griffin had re-signed with the Clippers in July with the understanding that he'd be a 'Clipper for life.' His tenure with the Clippers after inking a \$171 million contract lasted just over half a season.

Griffin, who said he found out about the trade on Twitter, struggled from the floor against his former teammates, making just seven of 19 shots and finishing with 19 points in front of a crowd of 16,700 at Little Caesars Arena. During his time with the Clippers, Griffin was sometimes criticised for being too soft. On Friday he tried to establish a physical presence early, receiving a technical foul in the first quarter after jostling with one of the Clippers. "I have seen him compete night in and night out. This is a game he wanted, so the magnifying glass is on him," said Williams, who was playing his first game since signing a three-year, 24 million contract extension. In fairness to Griffin, the whole Pistons team was out of sync with the game on the line. Detroit scored just 15 points in the final quarter after leading by three, 80-77, after three quarters. "We didn't, obviously, play the way we wanted to. I didn't play the way I wanted to," Griffin said. "But that's the NBA. We had a good five-game run, and we'll get back to work tomorrow.'

Tobias Harris scored 12 points and Avery Bradley had 10. They were the key players the Clippers acquired in the deal that sent Griffin to Detroit. They both received loud cheers when the starting lineups were announced.



Elsewhere, Hassan Whiteside had 12 points and 16 rebounds and Dwyane Wade got a warm welcome in his return to south Florida as the Miami Heat beat the Milwaukee Bucks 91-85. Wade scored just three points but still made his presence felt by delivering a key block late in the game as the Heat snapped a five-game losing skid.

THREE NBA TITLES

Wade finished with 22 minutes of floor time in his first game since being acquired in a trade from the Cleveland Cavaliers on Thursday. He played 13 seasons and won three NBA championships in Miami before leaving as a free agent for his hometown Chicago Bulls in 2016. Wade did not start but entered halfway through the first quarter and received a standing ovation from the crowd of 20,010 at the American Airlines Arena.

Tyler Johnson scored 19 points and Bam Adebayo

added 15 points and 10 rebounds, and Josh Richardson chipped in 16 points for Miami. In Atlanta, LeBron James had a triple-double and Kyle Korver scored a season-high 30 points as Cleveland defeated the Atlanta Hawks 123-107 for a successful start after retooling their roster at the trade deadline. "It felt like we played together," said James, who had 22 points, 19 assists and 12 rebounds in 41 minutes. "Offensively and defensively the communication was really high. The ball was moving around. The ball was popping and everybody felt like they were in a good rhythm."

One day after unloading six players, including guards Isaiah Thomas and Wade, in three trades, the Cavaliers used a patchwork roster against the Hawks. Korver helped make up for a short bench, making seven of 13 from beyond the arc and finishing two points shy of equalling his career high of 32 points. — AFP



MANCHESTER CITY: Sergio Aguero scored four with both goals assisted by the brilliant De Bruyne. The Argentine completed his treble in the 77th minute, capitalising on Kasper Schmeichel's error and lifting a sublime finish over the Dane to become the fourth player to score at least 20 Premier League goals in four successive seasons.

Aguero saved the best for last, though, with a sensational dipping shot that crashed in off the underside of the crossbar.

Riyad Mahrez finally got his wish of an outing at

Manchester City's Etihad stadium, but only as a second-half substitute for Leicester a day after ending his standoff with the Foxes by returning to training.

Mahrez, 26, had missed Leicester's last two Premier League matches after not reporting for training for nine days in protest at Leicester's refusal to accept a bid from runaway leaders City before the January 31 transfer deadline.

Despite juggling a raft of injuries to attack-minded players, Kevin de Bruyne showed why City decided against matching Leicester's reported \$80 million fee (\$111 million) for Mahrez with a hat-trick of assists for Raheem Sterling and a quickfire Sergio Aguero double to put City 3-1 up before Mahrez made his return.

The Algerian was given a warm reception by both sets of fans as he replaced Ben Chilwell just after the hour mark with City still rumoured to be interested in sealing his signature come the end of the season. —Agencies

Kane returns to haunt Arsenal as Spurs soar to third

LONDON: Harry Kane did the North London derby damage to Arsenal once more as the Tottenham Hotspur striker's seventh goal in as many games against the Gunners secured a thoroughly deserved 1-0 win for Spurs yes-

Kane towered above the Arsenal defence to head home his 32nd goal of the season four minutes into the second half, as only some wayward finishing and stunning goalkeeping from Petr Cech saved the visitors from further embarrassment in front of a Premier League record crowd of 83,222 at Wembley.

"He is the present and the future," said Mauricio Pochettino when quizzed whether Kane's dominant header possessed traits of an old-fashioned English centre-forward. "It is amazing all that he is achieving, (I'm) so proud and happy he is in our side.'

Victory moved Spurs up to third above Liverpool and Chelsea, while sixth-placed Arsenal now lie six points off the top four. And more questions will be asked of Alexandre Lacazette's future role at the Emirates in the wake of Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang's arrival as the Frenchman missed a great late chance to snatch a point after coming off the bench.

"Kane made the difference, that is what he is about," Arsenal boss Arsene Wenger said. "Once they scored you could see we were wobbling for a while and they could have scored one or two more, but in the last 10 minutes we should have come back to 1-1."

Kane spoke this week of how being released from Arsenal's academy as an eight-year-old left him with a "chip on his shoulder". The man now christened 'one of their own' by the Spurs faithful hasn't let Arsenal forget that decision as after a first half short on clear-cut chances, Spurs exploded into life after the break.

Kane had headed the best opening of the first 45 minutes over, but made no mistake when powering Ben Davies' cross into the bottom

corner. The England striker then saw another golden headed chance go wide before Cech saved brilliantly from Kane, Christian Eriksen and Erik Lamela to keep Arsenal in the game.

Those saves so nearly proved crucial as Lacazette, introduced for the ineffectual Henrikh Mkhitaryan as Arsenal's new-look forward line failed to fire, shot wide with just French team-mate Hugo Lloris to beat a minute

"It's disappointing that we struggled in the last five minutes as the game should have been settled," said Spurs midfielder Eric Dier. "Harry Kane loves scoring against Arsenal. He should have had a few more as well.'

Manchester City can move 16 points clear at the top later when they host Leicester City, for whom Riyad Mahrez starts on the bench after ending his 10-day exile from training on Friday after being denied a deadline day move to City. At the other end of the table, Swansea City's stunning revival under Carlos Carvalhal continued as Ki Sung-Yueng's fine strike nine minutes from time earned a 1-0 win over Burnley. The Welsh side are now unbeaten in nine games in all competitions and moved up to 14th, two points above the relegation zone. — AFP

Amid booming businesses, firms struggle to find workers

PARIS: Business is booming for Sylvie Guinard, who runs French machine manufacturer Thimonnier. The problem is, she can't find the enough staff - even in a country where millions of people are out of work. Guinard, who has a workforce of about 80, struggled for months to find the 10 engineers and technicians she needed to try to keep pace with an order book that rose by a third last year, and she still has two roles unfilled.

What's more, the situation's even more desperate at her suppliers. "They just can't find workers to make parts for us. I've got suppliers that are screwing up all my orders," said Guinard, whose family-owned company near Lyon exports 85 percent of the machines it makes for the packaging industry.

Thimonnier and its labor shortages are emblematic of the wider French manufacturing industry and, in turn, oth-

er Western countries like Germany and the United States where a strong economic rebound is outpacing the capacity of workforces.

The situation is most stark in France as the labor shortages - a problem that also afflicts the construction, engineering and IT industries - come despite a stubbornly high unemployment rate that is currently 9.4 percent and

has not dropped below 9 percent for six years.

The reason for the simultaneous high unemployment and lack of workers is a massive skills mismatch. France simply does not produce enough of the skilled workers it now needs. That means that even as the country is enjoying its strongest growth in six years, the lack of skilled workers is creating production bottlenecks and snarling up supply chains, company executives told Reuters. That in turn is potentially capping how fast the economy can grow.

More than a third of French manufacturing companies are operating at full capacity, the highest level since early 1990, while 40 percent report difficulties recruiting workers, a quarterly survey from the INSEE statistics office showed last month. In a sign of surging demand for labor, hiring on permanent contracts rose 6.4 percent in the fourth quarter to 48 percent, levels not seen since before the global financial crisis.

As elsewhere in the West, wage pressures are building and many employers are resigned to having to raise salaries at some point. "There's a real skills deficit because many young people have turned their back on the industrial sector," said Guinard. "Bidding competition is going to set in, but it'll be disastrous for industry because it's already hard to get by with the hourly rates we have in France.'

Dangling perks

Companies in France are moving to head this off by attracting skilled workers by other means, such as dangling long-term contracts, training and other perks. For pumps and valves maker Poclain Hydraulics, this involves helping to pay for childcare, offering concierge services and even getting a bus stop built at the company's head-

quarters in an industrial park 55 km (34 miles) north of Paris.

"It's clear that the trend in France is towards wage pressure ... but for now it's limited," said Alain Everbecq, Poclain's head of human resources. While he expected wage increases of about 2 percent this year, he said that could change when the company, which employs

2,400 worldwide and nearly 900 in France, reviews salaries in July.

Pierre Vauterin, who runs Triumph Controls France, a small aircraft and rail components maker near Paris, said he faces direct competition for engineers and technicians from his much bigger clients, who can offer more gener-

"I often hire young people, telling them that they'll get more responsibilities than what they'd get starting at (airplane engine maker) SNECMA or Airbus," he said, adding that they get training to build up their skills.

Hiring, margins

Many employers have until now avoided moving to permanent contracts over fears that under France's strict labor rules they would not be able to let workers go if business sours down the line.

cerns with an overhaul of the labor code in September, his first major reform. However employers say it is largely booming client demand, rather than the labor reforms, that has pushed private sector hiring to record levels.

While companies may be doing their utmost to avoid raising wages, eager to protect margins after years of weak growth, they may soon have no choice as competition among employers heats up, said Alain Roumilhac, head of ManpowerGroup in France, the U.S. staffing company's biggest market.

"Companies are very cautious about their margins. When we talk to clients, they say that if we can't get the salary they planned on, then they would rather not hire," he told Reuters.

than expected, margins are improving and they've got flexibility to increase wages," he said. Employers want to avoid following in the steps of Germany where the IG Metall union and the Suedwestmetall employers' federation struck a deal this week for a 4.3 percent pay

Yet French companies have over the last decade tended to raise wages faster than in other euro zone countries, slowly but steadily eroding their competitiveness internationally.

As the economy has picked up, wage growth has reached levels not seen since 2008, reaching 3.3 percent in the third quarter, according to the most recent data from the INSEE.—Reuters

Fresh downward pressures on Dubai's residential property prices in 2017

KUWAIT: Dubai's residential property market shows few signs of bouncing back quickly from a now three-year downturn. Having stabilized in 2016, prices saw renewed declines in 2017 as housing supply far outpaced demand. According to property firm Asteco, the prices of apartments and villas fell by 7.8 percent y/y and 5.6 percent y/y respectively in 4Q17, the fastest drop for several quarters. Prices are down 16-19 percent from their peaks of

These trends are confirmed by other data sources. Reidin, another real estate property tracker, shows villa and apartment prices down 1.9 percent y/y and 3.5 y/y respectively in Q4. Latest data on Phidar Advisory's Dubai 9/5 House price Index also points to softness in Dubai's

Alongside lower prices, rents have also been falling. According to Asteco, rents were down 11.1 percent y/y for apartments and 9.6 percent y/y for villas in Q4, with accelerated declines from earlier in the year. Similar to sales prices, rents are down 19-20 percent from their previous peaks. This may even understate market pressures, with some of the adjustment coming from non-price factors such as better payment terms or rent-free periods. With rents falling faster than sales prices, yields on property investment have become more compressed.

Tighter regulations

Dubai's property market has been on a rollercoaster ride for more than a decade. Residential prices fell by around half in the years following the 2008-09 financial crisis, but rebounded from 2013, helped by the return of confidence linked to the swift rise in oil prices back above

\$100 per barrel. Indeed, the market was likely driven by speculative buyers hoping to cash in on Dubai's economic recovery. The emirate's award as host of the Expo 2020 event in 4Q13 also saw a spike in the number of buyers entering the real estate market. This pushed apartment prices up by a staggering 60 percent y/y that quarter, with villa prices up 35 percent y/y.

To prevent a repeat of the boom-bust cycle in property prices that had plagued Dubai's economy before, the authorities tightened regulations. They doubled the land registration fee to 4 percent and introduced tighter loanto-value ratios to help mitigate risks to banks' balance sheets, rein in speculative activity and gear the market more towards end-buyers. This had an almost immediate impact. Growth in apartment prices slowed from 41 percent y/y in 1H14 to 19 percent y/y in 2H14, while villa prices slowed from 20 percent y/y to 8 percent y/y during the same period.

Prices pressured

Growth in supply has been a key factor in recent price weakness - and a legacy of the long lead times in bringing arge real estate projects to market. According to Jones Lang LaSalle (JLL), a property consultant, growth in housing supply slowed slightly from 3.9 percent y/y in 2016 to 2.9 percent y/y in 2017. With population growth possibly in the range of 1-2 percent y/y, occupancy rates continued to remain low, adding further downward pressure on prices. Meanwhile, demand remained lackluster as the impact of more stringent loan-to-value rules was compounded by the effects of higher interest rates, higher fuel costs, and modest wage and job growth, all of which reduced consumer purchasing power. Transaction levels in 2017 were low compared to earlier years, averaging AED3.5 billion per month, down 6.5 percent from 2016. But they were helped by a shift towards the more affordable housing segment, mainly as a result of a rise in the incidence of cash-strapped and risk averse buyers.

The property market downturn has not been exclusive to Dubai, or to the residential sector. Prices of apartments and villas in Abu Dhabi fell by a steeper 8.0 percent y/y and 7.9 percent y/y respectively, on average, in 4Q17, with the market appearing to suffer from the same issue of oversupply. Prices and rents in the commercial property

sector are also falling. Meanwhile, other GCC countries are witnessing their own property market corrections.

Prices to remain weak

One key factor in recent market weakness - rising supply - is expected to grow over coming quarters: JLL expect supply growth to pick up to 9 percent this year. The near completion of a number of residential developments, including New Dubai Gate in the Jumeirah Lake Towers district, The Pad in Business Bay, Eagle Heights in Sports City and Serenia Residences on Palm Jumeirah, will likely add 17,000 new apartments to the market in early 2018. Although project launches are expected to ease off in the 2H18, the projected supply increase in 2019, at 8 percent, is nearly as large.

Rising supply means that the improving macroeconomic climate in the UAE is unlikely to trigger a sharp recovery in property prices. We expect non-oil growth to accelerate to 3.7 percent this year - the strongest in the Gulf region and up from an estimated 3.3 percent in 2017 helped by an easing pace of austerity, stronger regional growth and rising infrastructure spending ahead of Expo 2020. Consumer demand will also be affected by the decline in purchasing power from the new 5 percent VAT and rising interest rates. A central bank survey suggests that credit standards are still tightening, though at a slower pace than before.

There are, however, some positive factors. One is that supply growth could disappoint relative to forecasts. JLL, for example, state that new supply typically comes in at around 40 percent of initial projections, suggesting that the supply-demand gap will not end up as large as the raw figures above imply.

Another positive is the cheaper dirham, which will make the property sector more attractive to international investors. The dirham fell 10 percent versus the euro in 4Q17 due to weakness in the US dollar to which it is pegged. This means apartment prices fell 13 percent y/y in euro terms in 4Q17 - although some of this was a reversal of the rise in prices due to earlier dollar strength. Finally, there may be upsides from the run-up in oil prices to \$70 per barrel, which if sustained, would boost investor confidence in the UAE, strengthen the financial climate and improve the fiscal position.

Wall Street chill threatens to put IPO activity on ice

NEW YORK: Wide swings in the US stock market has blunted initial public offering (IPO) activity on Wall Street in what was set to be the busiest week for new listings in more than twoand-a-half years.

All signs points to the disruption to IPOs continuing. Ten companies had planned US stock market debuts for this week, according to Renaissance Capital, a manager of IPO-focused exchange traded funds. It would have followed the biggest January haul of IPO proceeds on record, and would have been the most active IPO week since June 2015, Thomson Reuters data showed.

Only six companies went ahead with their IPO due to the volatile stock market, which has sapped much of the investor demand for new listings.

This bodes poorly for companies looking to pull the IPO trigger in the short term. Forty companies have filed for an IPO with the US Securities and Exchange Commission in the past year, aiming to raise an aggregate \$9.2 billion, according to data from Renaissance Capital. This does not include so-called confidential IPO filings which are not yet visible on the SEC's website.

"This volatility has the potential to put IPOs on ice," said Kathleen Smith, principal at Renaissance Capital. A saving grace for the IPO market is that mid-February typically sees a lull period for new listings. This is because the year-end financial information necessary for filing an IPO by a calendar-year company with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) goes stale in the middle of this month. After that, companies will need to compile and audit a new set of quarterly earnings. Only three IPOs are currently scheduled

"When stability does come back to the market, the IPO market should benefit from a growing domestic and global economy with heightened consumer confidence," said Lear Beyer, co-head of Equity Capital Markets Origination and head of Financial Institutions Group Origination at Wells

US stocks see-sawed this week, demonstrating swings Wall Street has not seen in years. The S&P 500 closed down 3.75 percent on Thursday and was on track for its biggest weekly percentage drop since 2011. IPO postponements included a \$500-million listing of IPSCO Tubulars, the US subsidiary of Russian oil and gas pipe maker TMK; the \$220-million flotation of Turkish fastfood chain operator TFI Tab Food Investments; and a \$130-million listing by Argentine biotechnology firm Bioceres. Medical technology company Motus GI, scheduled to list on Thursday, also did not price its IPO this week.

The biggest IPO to go ahead was the \$437-million listing for Cactus Inc, which supplies wellheads and pressure control equipment. Other listings included Victory Capital Holdings and Chinese wearable technology company Huami, although the Victory IPO priced at \$13 per share, below its \$17 to \$19 indicated price range. Cardlytics priced on Thursday in a \$70-million listing. Listings for blank-check company Mudrick Capital and medical aesthetics provider Evolus Inc went ahead, while Quintana Energy Services sold shares at \$10, below its \$12-\$15 target range. Of the seven listings this week, four were trading below their IPO prices on Friday.

"Investors will be looking at what companies and sectors will benefit from the impact of the recent tax reform and a higher interest rate environment relative to inflation fears that have disrupted the market," said Beyer. — Reuters

Britain's Mirror buys Express for £126.7m as sales drop

BRITAIN: The publisher of Britain's left-wing Daily Mirror newspaper struck a £126.7 million deal on Friday to buy a series of titles including the right-wing Daily Express in a bid to stem a decline in advertising revenues and sales. The papers were the biggest two in Britain after World War II but are both seeing big drops in circulation, according to the latest figures. The £126.7 million (\$176 million, 143.6 million) deal signals a major consolidation for a sector that is struggling against falling revenues in Britain.

The Daily Mirror had a daily circulation of around

580,000 in December 2017, a drop of 18.84 percent since the same month in 2016, while the Daily Express fell to around 364,000 — a decline of 6.82 percent. Speaking to BBC radio, Simon Fox, chief executive of publisher Trinity Mirror, said the deal would lead to cost savings as the titles could now pool their resources.

But he pledged they would retain their identities: "The Daily Express is not going to become left-wing and the Mirror is not going to become right-wing.'

The Daily Express is strongly pro-Brexit, while the Daily Mirror advocated a vote to stay in the European Union in the run-up to the EU referendum in 2016.

The Express typically provides its loyal band of older readers with front pages focusing on arthritis, diabetes and blood pressure cure speculation; the weather; the EU, and immigration.

Trinity Mirror's share price was up 6.5 percent at around 1000 GMT following the announcement. The titles of Daily Express owner Northern and Shell "have a large


and loyal readership, a growing digital presence and a stable revenue mix," he said.



KUWAIT: Boursa Kuwait ended last week in the red zone. The Price Index closed at 6,654.55 points, down by 0.46 percent from the week before closing, the Weighted Index decreased by 0.61 percent after closing at 410.30 points, whereas the KSX-15 Index closed at 942.42 points down by 0.12 percent. Furthermore, last week's average daily turnover decreased by 10.74 percent, compared to the preceding week, reaching KD 13.62 million, whereas trading volume average was 94.53 million shares, recording a decrease of 15.62 percent.

The three Boursa indices ended the week's trading with mixed losses, in parallel with the noticeable declines recorded by the international and regional stock markets during most of the week's sessions, which came as a result to the strong selling pressures that included many listed stocks in the market, in addition to the continued profit collection operations on the leading stocks, especially after the increases recorded by such stocks on last January.

Also, the market witnessed such performance amid decreased trading indicators of both the cash liquidity or the number of traded stocks, whereas the total value reached by the end of the week around KD 68.08 million, against KD 76.28 million in the previous one, while the volume reached 472.64 million stock by the end of last week, against 560.10 million stock in a week earlier.

In addition, the Boursa recorded during the last week market losses exceeded KD 155 million, as the market capitalization reached by the end of the week KD 27.54 billion, down by 0.57 percent of its level in a week earlier, where it was KD 27.70 billion, and the market gains since the beginning of the year 2018 contracted to reach about KD 602.65 million, with a growth of 2.24 percent compared to its value on the last trading day of the last year, where it reached then KD 26.94 billion. (Note: The market capitalization for the listed companies in the Regular Market is calculated based on the average number of outstanding shares as per the latest available financial statements).

Moreover, the market initiated its trading in the KSX-15 recorded 3.01 percent growth. the first session of the week with negative performance affected by the selling operations that included many stocks of different sectors, especially in the Telecommunications sector, the most declining one by the end of the session, which was negatively reflected on the three indices' performance, especially the KSX-15 Index that lost around 0.33 percent of its value by the end of the session. The Boursa ended the next session with mixed closings for its three indices, whereas the Price Index was able to compensate its previous session's losses supported by the purchasing operations that targeted some small-cap stocks especially in the last moments of the session, which witnessed exceptional trading on some idle stocks; while the Weighted and KSX-15 indices ended the session in the red zone affected by the continued profit collection operations that were concentrated on the leading and heavy stocks.

On the mid-week session however, the market returned to record grouped losses for its three indices, affected by the strong selling pressures that included leading and small-cap stocks in light of the fears that over controlled the traders, in light of the negative environment that the GCC and International markets are suffering of.

On Wednesday, the market witnessed a green closing for the three market indices for the first time in the week, as a result to the relative recovery of the international markets, which caused the return of the purchasing operations to appear and included many stocks of different sectors, especially in the Real Estate and Financial Services sectors. The market returned to fluctuate on the end of week session, as the Weighted and KSX-15 indices were able to compensate some losses by realizing limited gains by the end of the session, while the Price Index returned to the red zone again, to increase its losses on the weekly level.

For the annual performance, the Price Index ended last week recording 3.85 percent annual gain compared to its closing in 2017, while the Weighted Index increased by 2.21 percent, and

Six of Boursa Kuwait's sectors ended last week in the red zone, five recorded increases, whereas the Health Care sector's index closed with no change from the week before. The Telecommunications sector headed the losers list as its index declined by 5.11 percent to end the week's activity at 547.75 points. On the other hand, last week's highest gainer was the Technology sector, achieving 7.16 percent growth rate as its index closed at 507.60 points. Whereas, in the second place, the Basic Materials sector's index closed at 1,318.53 points recording 1.84 percent increase. The Real Estate sector came in third as its index achieved 1.63 percent growth, ending the week at 1,079.04 points.

Sectors' Activity

The Real Estate sector dominated a total trade volume of around 152.09 million shares changing hands during last week, representing 32.18 percent of the total market trading volume. The Banks sector was second in terms of trading volume as the sector's traded shares were 30.48 percent of last week's total trading volume, with a total of around 144.08 million

On the other hand, the Banks sector's stocks were the highest traded in terms of value; with a turnover of around KD 35.88 million or 52.70 percent of last week's total market trading value. The Real Estate sector took the second place as the sector's last week turnover was approx. KD 9.05 million representing 13.30 percent of the total market trading value. —Prepared by: Studies & Research Department - Bayan Investment Co.

Wall St rebounds but posts worst week in two years

NEW YORK: US stocks ended a wild week with a burst of buying, pushing the S&P 500 up 1.5 percent on Friday, but still recorded their worst week in two years, and investors braced for more volatile trading days ahead.

The sharp falls of the week confirmed the market was in a correction, down more than 10 percent from a Jan. 26 record high, and throwing the nearly nine-year bull market off course. The newly volatile market was shaken in part by rising bond yields, which led stock investors to rethink

their positions after months of steady gains. The S&P 500 ended the week nearly 9 percent below the all-time high set just two weeks ago.

"I don't see any reason to think that we're setting a pattern for next week or the rest of the year," said Rob Stein, chief executive officer of Astor Investment Management in Chicago. "The only pattern we're setting is more volatility." On Friday alone, the S&P 500 swung from gains of up to 2.2 percent to declines of 1.9 percent, echoing the big swings of the past week. The Dow moved in a range of more than 1,000 points, a more modest change than on Monday when the Dow fell as much as nearly 1,600 points.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 330.44 points, or 1.38 percent, to 24,190.9, the S&P 500 gained 38.55 points, or 1.49 percent, to 2,619.55, and the Nasdaq Composite added 97.33 points, or 1.44 percent, to 6,874.49. Technology was the best-performing group on Friday, with Microsoft Corp, Alphabet Inc and Facebook Inc giving the biggest individual boosts to the S&P 500. Energy was the lone major S&P sector to end negative as


oil prices tumbled.

The benchmark S&P 500 fell 5.2 percent for the week, its biggest weekly percentage drop since January 2016. For the week, the sector that got hammered the most was energy.

Ninety-six S&P 500 stocks are down 20 percent or more from their own one-year highs, according to Thomson Reuters data.

The sharp selloff in recent days was kicked off by concerns over rising inflation and bond yields, sparked by last week's January US jobs report. 'You have a fundamental difference between the economy and earnings doing well, versus interest rates going up and inflation picking up, and it's still a question of which will dominate," said Giri Cherukuri, head trader at OakBrook Investments LLC in Lisle, Illinois.

Equities for years have looked relatively attractive compared to the low yields offered by bonds, but the rise in Treasury yields has diminished the allure of stocks, especially with stock valuations at historically expensive levels.—Reuters

In Oman desert, a European venture sets sights on Mars

Aiming to one day help humans survive on Mars

DHOFAR: Would-be astronauts in aluminium-coated suits venture out in rovers from a sprawling camp in Oman's barren desert: a simulation by a European venture aiming to one day help humans survive on Mars. Behind a barbed wire fence protected by soldiers from the Gulf sultanate, researchers in prefab facilities work away on experiments that include trying to grow vegetables in inhospitable terrain chosen for its resem-

blance to the red planet. Run by the Austrian Space Forum, a mainly volunteer collective, with the backing of the Omani government, the AMADEE-18 Mars Analog Mission has brought together researchers, inventors, space professionals and enthusiasts. For decades the realm of science fiction, sending a manned mission to Mars is

now the stated-albeit still distant-goal of the US government and entrepreneurs.

On Tuesday US billionaire Elon Musk launched the world's most powerful rocket-the SpaceX Falcon Heavy-

towards an orbit near Mars. In this remote corner of the Arabian Peninsula's Dhofar desert, the European-led project may be far less flashy-but it is still looking to answer major questions. "Once we go to Mars, and stay on Mars, we will have to use the resources we find on Mars because we cannot bring everything from Earth," forum president Alexander Soucek said. "So we have to use the

things we find there: first of all to sustain life there, to sustain missions there, and then in the longer run maybe also for other things."

'Responsibly and ethically'

The Austrian Space Forum does not have a rocket like Musk, but its members many with day jobs at traditional space agencies or private companies-share the entrepreneur's drive to be innova-

tive. In the increasingly crowded field of space exploration, Soucek says the project is carving out a special niche with its Mars simulations. "We get sponsors from private industry. We collect money, partnerships, invite people to join

forces," he said. Volunteer researcher Joao Lousada was struggling into a pressure-simulating exoskeleton suit with the help of three technicians. Weighing more than 50 kilograms, it is custom-built to simulate the constricted movement astronauts would feel on Mars-and takes a grueling hours-long process just to put on. Like the other volunteers he watched the Falcon Heavy launch with awe, but he said there were serious issues about the commercialization of space. "You can't claim the moon,

you can't claim asteroids so mining comes into a bit of a legal loophole," Lousada said. "But... I think it's a very interesting idea. I think definitely we should look into using resources from asteroids that are not available on Earth or are less frequent on Earth." Once suited up, Lousada and fellow researcher Kartik Kumar mounted rovers and rode off under the blazing sun to complete their set of experiments in the desert. Returning before dusk, Kumar-an expert on space debris-reflected on the role and responsibility of space voyagers. "We should never forget that as we explore our own planet and the solar system we have to do it responsibly and ethically," said Kumar.

'Tomorrow, perhaps reality'

Since 2015, the United States and Luxembourg have moved to the forefront of what has been dubbed the new space race, creating legal frameworks that could eventually allow mining in space. The European Union has yet to take a position, as its members are on vastly different pages over the controversial topic. "Can you just go there and take resources or not?" Soucek said. There are a few things you have to sort out from technical and economic and also political point of view. But as always in space, today it's science fiction. Tomorrow, perhaps reality." —AFP

Facebook pledges \$10mn for community leaders

LONDON: Facebook said Friday that it will issue up to \$10 million (8.2 million euros) in grants to help support and train community leaders around the world. The tech giant unveiled its new initiative at a London summit of more than 300 community leaders from across Europe. The Facebook Community Leadership Program will offer residency, fellowship and training opportunities, as well as community leadership circles and specialized assistance on the social networking platform. "Facebook will commit tens of millions of dollars to the program, including up to \$10 million in grants that will go directly to people creating and leading communities," it said in a statement.

While the social network is a platform for virtual communities to gather, it is also a vehicle for advertisers to reach its more than 2 billion active users. Facebook last week said it booked nearly \$13 billion in sales in the last three months of last year. —AFP

What's next for SpaceX?

WASHINGTON: In successfully sending the world's most powerful rocket into space, SpaceX founder Elon Musk has pulled off yet another spectacular gamble. The question now is what's next for SpaceX and the space industry following the launch of Musk's Tesla roadster into space aboard a Falcon Heavy rocket?

Satellites

Falcon Heavy can launch far heavier payloads than other rockets-more than twice as much as its closest rival, the Delta IV Heavy rocket built by United Launch Alliance, the joint venture between Boeing and Lockheed Martin. "Falcon Heavy opens up a new class of payload," Musk told reporters following Tuesday's launch from Cape Canaveral in Florida. By blasting his electric car into space, Musk not only pulled off a publicity coup but also showed potential clients that SpaceX can deliver the goods. Using reusable boosters, SpaceX has a cost advantage-at 90 million dollars a launch it is three times cheaper than its rivals. It has already lured two clients: the US Air Force and Arabsat, a consortium of Arab nations seeking to have communications satellites put into orbit. The market, however, has changed significantly since Musk announced the Falcon Heavy project in 2011.

SpaceX took a lot of time to develop its powerful rocket, and spent more than half a billion dollars doing so, according to Musk. During that time, a lot of progress been made in increasing the capability of smaller rockets-including SpaceX's own Falcon 9 — and reducing the size of satellites. "There is a part of the commercial market that requires Falcon Heavy," SpaceX president Gwynne Shotwell told the Los Angeles Times last year. "It's there, and it's going to be consistent, but it's much smaller than we thought."

Moonshot

One year ago, SpaceX announced that it had signed a contract to send two paying passengers into orbit around the moon, something which hasn't been done since NASA's Apollo 17 mission in December 1972. The space tourists would ride aboard a passenger version of SpaceX's Dragon 2 capsule, which has already been used by NASA

Since the 2016 coup attempt in Turkey, authorities have jailed more than 50,000 people, sacked or suspended another 150,000 and closed more than 150 media outlets over alleged links to the failed putsch. Monitoring groups have also accused Turkey of blocking access to social media sites, particularly in the aftermath of militant attacks. The government has denied the accusation.

Last year, Turkey's telecommunications watchdog said access to online encyclopedia Wikipedia had been blocked, citing a law allowing it to ban access to websites deemed a threat to national security. Scenes showing alcohol and cigarette consumption are blurred out in most television broadcasts, and scenes involving physical intimacy are often cut out from cable and premium programming. Arslan, however, said there was no censorship on television programming in Turkey, adding every channel could broadcast "within the scales of fairness and moral judgments". —Reuters

'Sinking' Pacific nation is getting bigger, says study

'These islands are geologically dynamic and are constantly changing'

WELLINGTON: The Pacific nation of Tuvalu-long seen as dumped by storms could offset the erosion caused by rising a prime candidate to disappear as climate change forces up sea levels — is actually growing in size, new research shows. A University of Auckland study examined changes in the geography of Tuvalu's nine atolls and 101 reef islands between 1971 and 2014, using aerial photographs and satellite imagery. It found eight of the atolls and almost three-quarters of the islands grew during the study period, lifting Tuvalu's total land area by 2.9 percent, even though sea levels in the country rose at twice the global

Co-author Paul Kench said the research, published Friday in the journal Nature Communications, challenged the assumption that low-lying island nations would be swamped as the sea rose. "We tend to think of Pacific atolls as static landforms that will simply be inundated as sea levels rise, but there is growing evidence these islands are geologically dynamic and are constantly changing," he said. "The study findings may seem counter-intuitive, given that (the) sea level has been rising in the region over the past half century, but the dominant mode of change over that time on Tuvalu has been expansion, not erosion.

Offset the erosion

It found factors such as wave patterns and sediment

water levels. The Auckland team says climate change remains one of the major threats to low-lying island nations. But it argues the study should prompt a rethink on how such countries respond to the problem. Rather than accepting their homes are doomed and looking to migrate to countries such as Australia and New Zealand, the researchers say they should start planning for a long-term future.

"On the basis of this research we project a markedly different trajectory for Tuvalu's islands over the next century than is commonly envisaged," Kench said. "While we recognize that habitability rests on a number of factors, loss of land is unlikely to be a factor in forcing depopulation of Tuvalu." The study's authors said island nations needed to find creative solutions to adapt to climate change that take into account their homeland's evolving

Suggestions included moving populations onto larger islands and atolls, which have proved the most stable and likely to grow as seas rise. "Embracing such new adaptation pathways will present considerable national scale challenges to planning, development goals and land tenure systems," they said. "However, as the data on island change shows there is time (decades) to confront these challenges." —AFP

Human eggs grown to maturity in lab

PARIS: Scientists have grown human egg cells to full maturity in the lab in a potential breakthrough for fertility treatment, they announced in a study published Friday. Researchers in New York and Edinburgh developed a new method to grow eggs from very early-stage cells obtained from ovary tissue, a team reported in the journal Molecular Human Reproduction. The eggs were grown to the point at which they could be fertilized

This had previously been achieved with mouse egg cells, while human eggs had been successfully cultivated starting from a much later stage of development. "The latest study is the first time a human egg has been developed in the lab from its earliest stage to full maturity," said a statement from the University of Edinburgh. Experts who did not take part in the

research hailed the achievement as promising, but stressed it would take years to translate into a safe and proven therapy.

The technique holds promise specifically for women who have to go through sterilizing treatments such as chemotherapy. It would allow them to freeze early-stage egg cells before undergoing treatment, to be matured in the lab at a later time to be fertilized with sperm to make a baby. Traditionally, cancer patients can have a piece of ovary removed before chemotherapy, but re-implanting the tissue later may risk reintroducing cancer.

"This is an elegant piece of work, demonstrating for the first time that human eggs can be grown to maturity in a laboratory," Channa Jayasena of the Imperial College London said in a comment on the study results. "It would take several vears to translate this into a therapy. However, this is an important breakthrough, which could offer hope to women with infertility in the future." Azim Surani of the University of Cambridge pointed out that the eggs yielded by the research were smaller than normal, and "it might be of interest to test the developmental potential of these eggs".—AFP

Experts advise against epilepsy drug in pregnancy

PARIS: An expert committee of Europe's medicines watchdog recommended Friday that a drug used to treat epilepsy and linked to malformations in children not be used in pregnancy. The compound, valproate, is also used for migraine and bipolar disorder, and doctors already advised against prescribing the medicine for pregnant women in France. France's medicines regulator, known by the acronym ANSM, asked the London-based European Medicines Agency (EMA) to conduct a risk review.

The EMA's Pharmacovigilance Risk Assessment

Committee (PRAC) said in a statement Friday it was recommending that valproate not be used by pregnant women for any of the three medical conditions. For women suffering from epilepsy, however, it may be impossible for some to stop after becoming pregnant, it said. These may have to continue treatment, though with "appropriate specialist care". The experts also advised against prescribing the drug for women "from the time they become able to have children", unless using contraception.

Valproate medicines are licensed under different names by national drugs authorities. The committee recommendations will now go to another body of the EMA, which deals with concerns over drugs that are not centrally authorized in the EU. Last April, a preliminary study showed that valproate caused "severe malformations" in as many as 4,100 children in France since the drug was first marketed in the country in 1967.—AFP







Kill Bill stunt coordinator backs Uma Thurman



ill Bill stunt coordinator Keith Adam says Uma Thurman should never have had to perform the 2003 stunt in which she was badly injured. The 47-year-old actress has blamed the producer, director Quentin Tarantino and his then co-workers E. Bennett Walsh and Harvey Weinstein for the incident in 2003 because she felt they forced her to perform the driving sequence, which she felt uncomfortable doing, and then covered up the evidence after the crash. And Adams says he was not on set on the day of the incident and never asked about or told that Uma Thurman would be performing that particular stunt. He told The Hollywood Reporter: "No stunts of any kind were scheduled for the day of Ms. Thurman's accident. All of the stunt department was put on hold and no one from the stunt department was called to set. "At no point was I notified or consulted about Ms. Thurman driving a car on camera that day. "Had I been involved I would have insisted not only on putting a professional driver behind the wheel but also insuring that the car itself was road-worthy and safe." Thurman made the revelation in a recent interview with The New York Times newspaper, explaining the accident which crushed her knees, left her with a concussion and required her to wear a neck brace to recover. But producer Lawrence Bender denied hiding anything from Uma and is adamant the safety of the cast and crew he works with is "vital" to him and he would never put someone in danger intentionally. He said: "I deeply regret that Uma suffered the pain she has, both physically and emotionally, for all of these years from the accident that occurred on the set of 'Kill Bill'. "The safety of the professionals who work on the movies I produce is vital to me and I never want to let anyone down. I never hid anything from Uma or anyone else nor did I participate in any cover up of any kind - and I never would. "I was informed of Uma's feelings in regard to this incident a few months ago and have done my best over this time to get as much verifiable information from all of the relevant sources that I could and shared it with Quentin. I wanted to make sure she had all of the answers she had been seeking. "I have great respect for Uma Thurman, both as an artist and a person, and only

ake Gyllenhaal, Ansel Elgort and Zendaya are set to star in thriller 'Finest Kind'. The trio have signed up for the new crime movie, written and directed by Brian Helgeland, which tells the story of two halfbrothers (Jake and Ansel), who make a deal with a crime syndicate and get involved with the Boston underworld. Gary Foster and Russ Krasnoff will produce the movie along with Dan Friedkin and Bradley Thomas. Jake and Riva Marker will also produce the film through their company Nine Stories. Helgeland previously won an Oscar for writing 'L.A. Confidential' and directed the Jackie Robinson biopic '42' and 'Legend', starring Tom Hardy. Meanwhile, Jake recently declared that 'Stronger' is the "most important" movie he has ever made. The 37-year-old star portrays Boston Marathon bombing survivor Jeff Bauman - who had both of his legs blown off near the finish line of the event in April 2013 - in the motion picture and admitted the film means more than any other because it helped Jeff to "heal". He said: "This movie has changed me in ways that I can't really put into words and is the most important film I've made so far for a number of reasons. I think we helped [Jeff] see things about himself that helped him heal, which, to me, is why I think this movie means more to me than anyone I've ever made." Gyllenhaal was "terrified" about being introduced to Jeff - whose memoir 'Stronger' inspired the movie - but now talks to him on a daily basis after spending two-and-a-half years shooting the film. He added: "I was terrified to meet him. But he trusted me. I have no clue why. We talk almost every day and I love him. If this movie only helped Jeff survive, then the two-and-a-half years I've spent making it have been worthwhile. If it touches anyone else, it's extra credit.'

Muslim singer forced to quit French show over terror posts

French Muslim singer who became an overnight star after dazzling judges on a TV talent show quit the contest Friday after coming under fire for past Facebook comments about terror attacks. Mennel Ibtissem, a 22-year-old student who wears a head wrap, was one of the top contestants on The Voice, where her English and Arabic version of Leonard Cohen's Hallelujah caused a sensation. But within days of Saturday's performance she was under pressure to bow out over old Facebook messages that appeared to question the terrorist nature of attacks that claimed scores of lives in France in 2016. The posts have been deleted but screen grabs of the remarks have been circulated on far-right websites. In one post after the July 2016 truck attack in the city of Nice, in which 86 people were killed, she said: "Here we go, it's become a routine, an attack a week, and, as usual, the 'terrorist' takes his ID with him. It's true that when you're plotting something nasty you never forget to take your papers with you." She was referencing a series of jihadist assaults in France in which police quickly named the killers through documents found on their bodies, including the 2015 Paris attacks that killed 130 people. In another post, days after two jihadists slit the throat of a priest in his Normandy church, she wrote: "The real terrorists are our government." The singer had apologized over the remarks, saving members of her family had been celebrating Bastille Day in Nice when the driver struck and that she had been "upset" by the failure of the authorities to prevent the attack. But the apology failed to quell the controversy. With private broadcaster TF1 under pressure to pull her out of the competition, including from relatives of the victims of the Nice attack, she quit on Friday. "I never meant to hurt anyone and the mere thought that my remarks hurt others hurts me, so I have taken the decision to quit this adventure," she said in a Facebook video that has been viewed over 860,000 times. The production company behind The Voice, ITV Studios France, said that despite her earlier apology the atmosphere on the show had become "too heavy" and hoped her decision to withdraw would "soothe tensions". But some of her fans expressed disappointment, amid allegations of anti-Muslim bias. On Ibtissem's Facebook page, Jihene Ferchiou wrote: "We must not delude ourselves. Your turban, your religion, your origins were the obstacle. "Clearly we have reached an unprecedented level of racism in France. It's a disgrace."



Wright found acting savior in God

etitia Wright almost gave up acting before she found God. The 24-✓ year-old actress landed her big break in the 2016 movie 'Urban Hymn' and now Wright has a role in the Marvel Cinematic Universe as Shuri in the new 'Black Panther' movie, but she admitted she almost walked away from her passion during a "very difficult" period in her life. But after taking a break and becoming a devout Christian she re-discovered her passion for the art form. Speaking on UK TV show 'This Morning' on Friday. Wright said: "Yeah I was going through a lot. A very difficult time in my life and I just needed to take a break from acting because I really idolized it. So I came off from it and I went on a journey to discover God and my relationship with God and I became a Christian and it really gave me so much love and life within myself and so much I felt secure and I felt I didn't need validation from anyone else or from getting a part. And my happiness wasn't dependent on that. It was dependent on my relationship with God." #METOO NY FASHION SHOW SPOTLIGHTS SEXUAL HARASSMENT

ight models, all subject to sexual harassment or assault in one form or another, took advantage of New York Fashion Week on Friday to raise awareness for the #MeToo movement sweeping the United States. Far from the bright lights of the most coveted fashion tickets in town, none of the women were famous. The venue was a room practically given for free by an affordable hotel close to Times

Instead it was an overtly political show organized by advocate and entrepreneur Myriam Chalek, who has made a name for herself by putting marginalized models on the runway during events such as a dwarf show in Dubai. If labels such as Tom Ford have also referenced women empowerment this week the Texan-born designer turned director showcased "Pussy Power" purses-Chalek says it is the entire point of her show.

"I feel like every woman has some kind of responsibility to do something and contribute to change," she told AFP. "If you are saying it's time to change or time's up, then do something about it." The clothes were not the star of the show, although the 30-year-old said the mix of fur and leather on the one hand, with silk and tulle on the other aimed to show both the strength and femininity of women. "The difference with this fashion show is that one of the criteria (for models) is that you had to be a victim of sexual misconduct to take part in this show," she explained.

Pig's mask

After walking the runway before the roughly 200 assembled guests, the eight models each took to the microphone in turn, standing next to a man dressed entirely in black, his face covered with a pig's mask. In a few minutes, they told their story, often years old of how a friend of the family, a boyfriend or an online predator had harassed them, assaulted or even raped them, their voices often breaking.

"I am a little shaken," said one, after recounting in detail how she was raped by a date and didn't dare tell her mother for weeks. "Standing here and talking about this is so important... I'm really sorry to say 'me too,' but I am really glad we are doing something about it finally," she added to huge applause. After their remarks, came a period of heavy silence. "I like the silence because I feel you felt it... how they became vulnerable one more time in front of you, a room full of strangers," said Chalek.

"I am not going to say this fashion show is going to change things overnight," she admitted. "But I'm hopeful you are going to leave this room talking about it and being more educated." "If we can even get just one woman to come out and not repress her feelings anymore, that's already an accomplishment," she said. — AFP

Diesel Fashion Week

stunt pokes fun at knock-off artists

iesel is ditching the catwalk to masquerade as knock-off merchants this Fashion Week, purporting to be a New York fake goods store only to flog customers the real thing. It's a clever gimmick for the 40-year-old Italian label, which is using the fall/winter 2018 edition of New York's twice-yearly style fest to open a pop-up shop on Canal Street in Chinatown, the heart of knock-off city in the US financial capital. Sweatshirts and T-shirts are stamped "Deisel"making the ruse believable. Hoodies cost \$60, jeans \$70 — again believably fake. Except these clothes are limited-range, designer goods.

"We have so many counterfeit products all over the world I thought, 'Why can't we play with this problem that we have?" Diesel founder Renzo Rosso told AFP, saying he believes that more than a

million counterfeit Diesel goods are sold annually around the world. "We created a fake product, a fake name, and we came to the counterfeit district."

The store opened under the radar last week and hundreds of customers have already browsed and purchased, with most of the initial buyers blissfully unaware that the joke's on them. "People come and they think it is a fake product. When they discover it's not a fake product, they can sell it for three or four times the value!" said Rosso, 62. Given the queue to get in, it's paying off. The store is scheduled to close tomorrow, possibly even earlier if it runs out of stock. Otherwise, customers can go down the street to buy fake Louis Vuitton bags or imitation Rolex watches. — AFP

Carnival madness brings joy to Rio mental institute

residents of a Rio de Janeiro mental institute, carnival madness means more than just fun. At a street party held this week for the patients of the Nise da Silveira Institute, 1,500 patients, staff and relatives dressed up in everything from tigers to harlequin costumes or pirates. Also invited were dozens of neighbors from the modest neighborhood of Engenho de Dentro, which is close to the stadium used in the 2016 Olympic athletics contests, but far from the usual carnival territory of southern Rio.

The institute used to be named the Pedro II Psychiatric Center but was renamed after Brazil's most famous psychiatrist, da Silveira, who died in 1999. A student of Carl Jung, she revolutionized mental health practices in Brazil, leading to the abolition of aggressive treatments like lobotomy. Instead, her methods focused on bringing patients back into society-an approach that continues today at the institute. In 2001, staff turned an existing art-therapy workshop into a "bloco," the name for the amateur street parties that spring up all over Rio in different sizes during carnival season.

Like all "blocos," it needed a catchy name and this one was called "Loucura suburbana," roughly translating as "Madness on the outskirts." "The goal was to get patients involved and to help the neighborhood revitalize its carnival, since the 'blocos' have all gone to the tourist zones," said Ariadne de Moura Mendes, who launched the project.

Sense of freedom

Before hitting the streets, everyone gathered in the courtyard in their costumes. Some came walking on stilts, others carried big colorful flags. For Andre Poesia, 42, it was time to warm up his vocal chords. Suffering from schizophrenia, he is one of the "bloco's" singers, who perform from a sound truck. "Carnival is part of my life. Our 'bloco' shows that we must overcome prejudice. Crazy people are also capable of being happy and having fun," he said.

Monica, another schizophrenia patient, was itching to get started. "I feel free here," the 42-year-old cried out, wearing a fuchsia tutu and stopping passersby to give them a kiss on the cheek. Silas Goncalves, wearing a flowery T-shirt, played drums, a key component of the samba music popular in "blocos." He's being treated for alcohol and cocaine addictions and says that carnival is good therapy.

"It is great to be among friends rather than shut inside," Goncalves, 52, said. "Thanks to the carnival, patients stop seeing themselves through society's prejudices, which consider them dangerous, useless or lazy," said de Moura Mendes. "They can express themselves freely, they're real artists."



'Devil' mayor

Whether rehearsing the music or making costumes, the patients spend much of the year preparing the annual "Madness on the outskirts" party. There's a stock of extra costumes for those who don't have one kept in what used to be a chapel for holding wakes. Marcio Inacio, 49, is a former patient for depression, and this year came to build a huge and irreverent carnival effigy of Mayor Marcelo Crivella, depicting him with devil hornsadig at a mayor who is an evangelical bishop and appears to disapprove of the carnival excesses.

It's also a dig at Crivella for having ordered budget cuts which have hurt the city's already struggling health system. Among those feeling the pinch is the mental home's carnival: government subsidies that previously helped it come to life have been axed. — AFP
