

Yemen govt warns of coup as separatists take over HQ

15 killed in street clashes • Southerners want government ousted

ADEN: Yemen's government accused southern separatists of an attempted coup yesterday after they took over its headquarters amid fierce clashes in the city of Aden. The fighting, which killed at least 15 people, threw war-torn Yemen into further chaos and threatened to undermine President Abedrabbo Mansour Hadi, who ordered his forces to stand down. Security sources and residents said clashes appeared to have spread to most of the city.

The government urged the Saudi-led military coalition, which has been supporting Hadi against Iranbacked Houthi rebels who control much of the north, to intervene. The southern separatists - who want the return of an independent state that ended with Yemen's unification in 1990 - backed Hadi's government against the Houthis but tensions between them had been rising.

"A coup is ongoing here in Aden against legitimacy and the country's unity," Prime Minister Ahmed bin Dagher said in a statement. Shortly afterwards, it was reported loyalist commanders had received orders from Hadi to disengage. "After talks with the Arab coalition... you must order all military units to cease fire immediately," a government statement said. Yesterday afternoon, coalition planes flew over the city.

Security sources told AFP that pro-separatist units

trained and backed by the United Arab Emirates had taken over the government headquarters in Aden after clashes. The 15 dead included three civilians, hospital sources said. Dozens were wounded. Doctors Without Borders (MSF) tweeted that one of its facilities in Aden had received 50 wounded and four dead. Saudi and Emirati troops present in Aden did not intervene, security sources said.

Separatist fighters and supporters danced at an intersection as truckloads of armed men drove through the streets. In the late afternoon, security sources said separatists approached the presidential palace where several members of the government were staying, but no clashes were reported. The fighting erupted after separatist protesters were prevented from entering the city for a rally to demand the government's ouster from Aden, which became its interim capital after the Houthis seized Sanaa in 2014.

The coalition, which launched its intervention against the rebels in March 2015, had urged restraint ahead of the planned protest. It called on all sides to "adhere to the language of calm dialogue", the Saudi state news agency SPA said late Saturday. Universities, schools and Aden's only international airport had all been

Sabeeh set to survive vote of no-confidence

KUWAIT: Minister of Social Affairs and Labor Hind Al-Sabeeh, who on Wednesday faces a vote of no-confidence in the National Assembly, appears to be in a very strong position to survive the motion. Ten lawmakers filed the motion last week following a grilling in which she was blamed of failing to rectify the imbalance in the demographic structure by stopping the influx of expatriates into the country. She was also accused of committing a number of administrative and financial violations.

Until yesterday, close to 20 lawmakers have said they will back the minister and only around 12 have said they will vote against her, with as many as 17 MPs undecided but appear more likely to either abstain or support the minister. The motion needs 25 votes to pass, which appeared to have a slim chance as of yesterday. MP Omar Al-Tabtabaei yesterday joined the group of

lawmakers who said they will support the minister, saying she is capable of adopting solutions to the problems. Tabtabaei however charged that some Kuwaiti diplomatic missions abroad are involved in the problem of maids' recruitment, saying he is ready to take the issue to the maximum level of questioning.

A number of assembly panels yesterday announced they will hold meetings this week with the ministers of foreign affairs, interior and education to discuss regional developments and the problem of stateless people or bedoons. Head of the foreign relations panel MP Hamad Al-Harshani said his committee will hold tomorrow a

meeting with Foreign Minister Sheikh Sabah Al-Khaled Al-Sabah to discuss the latest regional and international developments. The committee will meet on the same day with Interior Minister Sheikh Khaled Al-Jarrah Al-Sabah to discuss a draft memorandum of understanding about security cooperation with Iraq. He provided no details on the two meetings.

The Assembly's human rights defense committee will meet on Thursday with the interior minister to discuss issues related to the problems of bedoons, head of the committee MP Adel Al-Damkhi said. He said the decision was taken during vesterday's meeting of the committee and because the central agency for dealing with bedoon issue comes under the authority of the minister. Damkhi said the meeting yesterday debated what he called oppression against bedoons, but could not come up with a fundamental solution because various government sides did not provide any proposals.

News in brief Oatar, Oman sign agreements

MUSCAT: Qatar signed a memorandum of understanding with Oman on the development of bilateral investment and trade yesterday, nearly eight months into a crisis between the emirate and its Arab neighbors. The Omani news agency ONA said the agreement signed in Muscat covers a wide range of cooperation sectors including the production and export of food products from the sultanate to Qatar. Omani Agriculture Minister Fuad al-Sajwani, quoted by ONA, said the memorandum reflected the "solid relationship" between the two countries. The head of Qatar's delegation, minister of municipalities Mohamed bin Abdullah Al-Rumaihi, for his part, hailed the emirate's "strategic relations" with Oman.

Kamprad, frugal billionaire founder of Ikea, dies at 91

STOCKHOLM: Ingvar Kamprad, the farmer's son turned multibillionaire who founded the Ikea empire that revolutionized furnishing, has died aged 91, the firm said yesterday. Kamprad "passed away peacefully surrounded by his loved ones" at his home in the southern Swedish region of Smaland on Saturday "following a brief illness", Ikea said in a statement. He leaves behind a legacy of affordable interior design for households around the world, through Ikea's flat-pack furniture which customers can assemble themselves.

Kamprad's close friend Bertil Torekull told the Swedish daily Aftonbladet that the industrialist died from pneumonia which he contracted after a visit abroad, aggravated by "the frailty of old age". Swedish

Prime Minister Stefan Lofven said Kamprad "made home furnishing available for many people, not just the few" while King Carl XVI Gustaf added he was a "true entrepreneur" who "brought Sweden out to the world".

Born in 1926 to a farming family in Smaland, Kamprad, whose fortune in 2017 was estimated at €37.3 billion (\$46 billion) according to the Swiss economic magazine Bilan, founded the company at the age of 17. "He came from nowhere, but with help from his inner force, his ability and his will, he created something I think everyone is proud of when seeing Ikea out in the world," Swedish banker and industrialist Jacob Wallenberg told financial daily Dagens Industri.

Kamprad's legacy of creating affordable furniture has earned him admiration among consumers around the world. "He has paved the way for everyone to have nice furniture, not just the rich," Krister Mollander, a 70-year-old consumer, told AFP. "Good design became democratic through his ability," Steven Coetzee, a 45year-old tourist from South Africa, told AFP. "Everyone who would like to have something...designed nicely could afford to have it from Ikea.'

The story of Ikea acronym for Ingvar Kamprad, Elmtaryd and Agunnaryd (the name of his farm and town of origin) - began in 1943. Backed with modest financial support from his father, Kamprad began selling pens, picture frames, typewriters and other goods, delivering orders on his bicycle. His early success arose from squeezing his prices to undercut more

established competitors. In 1947 the young Kamprad started selling furniture made by local artisans, and four years later he began putting out the first of his mail order catalogues - which now have an annual print run of 200 million copies in 33 languages.

Saudis, UAE denied neutral venues

DUBAI: Saudi and UAE football authorities said yesterday their teams will play Asian Champions League away matches in Qatar despite a travel ban they have imposed on their Gulf neighbor. The decisions by the Saudi Arabian and United Arab Emirates football federations came after the Asian Football Confederation (AFC) decided overnight in Kuala Lumpur that their teams were required to play in Qatar and also host Qatari teams. The AFC ruled all matches would be played on a home-and-away basis as planned, after Saudi Arabia had called for fixtures against Qatari teams to be shifted to a neutral country. AFC said the decision to maintain the home-and-away format was made after an independent safety and security assessment was completed.

Shares of Saudi prince's firm surge

RIYADH: Shares in Saudi billionaire Prince Al-Waleed bin Talal's Kingdom Holding surged yesterday after he was released following three months of detention. The share price of the company, 95 percent of which is owned by Prince Alwaleed, rose the maximum allowed 10 percent at the start of the week's trading, regaining its level from before the

North Iran hit by massive snowfall

TEHRAN: After months of waiting for the snow to arrive, Tehranis were hit by massive snowfall overnight yesterday that shut airports and schools but delighted the ski community. The capital's Imam Khomeini International and Mehrabad airports were shut due to poor visibility "until further notice", state television said. Some 20 provinces in the west and north of Iran were affected by the snowfall that began on Thursday and peaked on Saturday night, with some mountainous areas receiving as much 1.3 m of snow, according to the official news

agency IRNA. With many schools closed and offices

delaying their opening times, Tehrani families made the most of the blizzard. "This past year we have had very bad news and this is the first good news we have had, and we are happy," Hadi, a transportation worker who had taken the day off to make snowmen with his children, told AFP. Iran's skiers, who have been denied much action in recent months due to an uncommonly warm winter, were also pleased.

"It's incredible. There's been a metre of powder today, and it's still snowing. My car is buried up to its side mirror," said a Western diplomat, waiting for the lifts to open at Dizin ski resort, an hour north of the capital. Iran's drivers were having less fun, with thousands blocked on motorways out of the capital.

Mohammad Ali Abtahi, who served as cabinet chief under ex-president Mohammad Khatami, posted a message on social media showing his car stuck on the motorway to the religious center of

Amir sponsors Flag hoisting ceremony today

KUWAIT: Kuwait celebrates today the 12-year anniversary of the ascendency of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah as he continues his responsible leadership of this nation and its people. It all started when His Highness Sheikh Sabah stood in parliament to be sworn in as the 15th Amir and ruler of Kuwait amid huge local support from the public

In a public address after a ceremony marking the event, His Highness vowed to bear this responsibility and to work hard for the benefit of the country. He urged the people to unite in their efforts in making Kuwait a modern and forward-thinking nation bound by science, innovation, cooperation, equality in rights and duties, democracy and freedom of thought and expression. He urged the people to place the best interests of the nation above their own, to disregard the lure of personal gain so that all may benefit and to abide by the rule of law and order. "Kuwait is the crown upon all of our heads," he had said.

Wisdom and intelligence

The fourth child of Sheikh Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, his wisdom and intelligence stems from a decades-long commitment to serving in the social, political and diplomatic spheres following extensive travel and tutelage at Al-Mubarakiya School, Kuwait's first formal educational establishment named after the late ruler, Sheikh Mubarak Al-Sabah.

Sheikh Sabah's initial foray into public office came in 1954, when he was appointed member in the supreme executive committee tasked with the role of the regulation of government interests and bodies. A year later, he was handed the role of director of the department of social and labor affairs, where he was instrumental in several factors, namely regulating the relationship between employer and employee. He is also behind the formation of sports clubs, a traditional culture body, public theatres and centers for technical and professional training, childcare, motherhood and people with special needs.

Upon the expansion of his role to include director of the publications department in 1957, Sheikh Sabah demonstrated a commitment to reviving old books and manuscripts and tasked a committee with writing the first book detailing the history of Kuwait. Kuwaiti journalism, regarded one of the most transparent in the Middle East, continues to benefit from His Highness, who is behind the publications law, which remains in use until this day, albeit some minor amendments.

As Kuwait declared its independence in 1961, he was appointed member of the Kuwaiti constitution's founding council. This was followed by his addition to the first official cabinet, where he assumed the role of minister of guidance in 1962.

Only one year later, he began a journey as minister of foreign affairs, where he remained the top man responsible for delivering Kuwait's diplomacy to the world for 40 years. On May 11, 1963, during the first year of Sheikh Sabah's time in office as minister, Kuwait became a member of the United Nations.

Diplomatic efforts

Diplomatically, he was involved in Kuwait-hosted talks in 1966 between warring parties in Yemen, Egypt and Saudi Arabia aimed at putting an end to the Yemeni civil war. When the relationship deteriorated between South and North Yemen, with both involved in border clashes, Sheikh Sabah visited the two countries (at the time) helping forge a peace agreement in 1972. He also successfully mediated an agreement of diplomatic principles between Oman and South Yemen, which was followed by a joint announcement of the resumption of diplomatic relations from Kuwait in 1984.

Throughout his tenure, the then minister assumed a balanced foreign policy that enabled Kuwait to over-

come some difficult periods such as the Iraq-Iran War of 1980 and its repercussions on the internal and external security and stability of his country. He also forged a strong relationship with countries around the world, particularly the five permanent member nations of the United Nations Security Council. These strong ties culminated in the emergence of a 35-nation coalition that

helped liberate Kuwait from invasion by Iraq in 1991 as a result of a Security Council resolution that paved the way for a military offensive against the occupying forces. Alongside his role as foreign minister, Sheikh Sabah was handed numerous roles due to his wise policies and diplomatic proficiency, namely acting information minister (1971-1975), deputy prime minister (1978), acting information minister (1982), deputy prime minister (1985-1992) and first deputy prime minister and foreign minister (1992). In 2001, he was tasked with forming the Kuwaiti cabinet in the place of the then Crown Prince and Prime Minister the late Amir Sheikh Saad Al-Abdallah Al-Sabah, who was suffering from a med-

Two years later, Sheikh Sabah became prime minister upon Amiri decree. It is during his time as prime minister that his ability to guide domestic policy came to light. The prime minister adopted a comprehensive

development-based vision focused particularly on economic growth through support of the private sector and entrepreneurism amongst the youth.

Economic spectrum

On the economic spectrum, a tour in Asia, including China, Japan, South Korea and Singapore, at the head of a business delegation in 2004 resulted in the joint signature of 10 mega deals and projects. He remained premier until 2006 when a cabinet session passed a motion appointing him Amir of Kuwait.

Over the 12 years under his reign, Kuwait has witnessed widespread development concentrated on a number of mega projects like Sabah Al-Ahmad Marine City - the first fully developed by the private sector.

Others in the services sector, include Jaber Hospital, Mubarak Al-Kabeer Port, Jaber Al-Ahmad International Stadium, Al-Zour Refinery, a soon-to-be-completed airport, several new bridges and roads, including Sheikh Jaber Al Ahmad Al Sabah causeway project which links Kuwait City to cities in the north and cities like South Al-Mutlaa. In accordance with his vision to

transform Kuwait into a financial and commercial hub, government also announced the 'New Kuwait 2035' development and diversification project based on mega projects. His Highness the Amir

made comments urging

nationals to stand together in the face of challenges and threats, namely the June 2015 terrorist attack on Al-Sadiq Mosque, which killed 27 people and injured over 200 others. Shortly after the sui-

cide attack, His Highness took it upon himself to visit the location in the person unannounced, where he uttered those renowned words, "those are my children."

While leading the hundreds of Kuwaitis who came at attend the mass funerals for the victims, he urged "the Kuwaiti family to stand together united through troubles and strife in tackling violence and fundamentalist thought that aims to undermine the other."

On the scale of his foreign policy, Kuwait over recent years has managed to adopt a pioneering role in the global humanitarian field thanks to his wise policies. Kuwait hosted three pledging conferences for international governments and organizations, co-chaired a similar event in London and attended another European Union-organized event in Brussels.

The Kuwait-hosted donors conferences raised a total \$7.5 billion from attending nations, while Kuwait

handed out a total 1.6 billion across all five gatherings as support for the victims of the Syrian conflict. The endeavors overseen by His Highness earned him the unprecedented title of 'Humanitarian Leader' and Kuwait, the title of 'Humanitarian Centre', both granted by the United Nations. Kuwait also plans to host a pledging conference dedicated to efforts aimed at rebuilding cities and towns in Iraq reclaimed from Islamic State group control in February 2018. His mediation efforts on a crisis that erupted in 2017 between three member countries of the Gulf Cooperation Council, including Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and Bahrain plus Egypt, on the one hand, and Qatar, on the other, have also been relentless. These efforts have been commended worldwide and have transformed from a unilateral effort to a global initiative, receiving the full backing of the United States and the European Union. Part of these efforts included tangible steps to hold the crucial regional bloc together, namely hosting a summit of GCC senior officials at its scheduled date in December and a football tournament of Gulf nations shortly after in January 2018.

Freedom of speech in Kuwait

social media activist is facing up to 20 years in jail on what may seem is his social media use and political view, but it is more complicated than that. He did not attend any court sessions for the criminal charges against him over a video he created, and therefore the court found him guilty. Before I go ahead and describe the implications of freedom of speech in Kuwait, I would like to make a few points clear:

1. I am blessed to not only have the freedom to write legal advice and my opinion on public platforms, but to also have complete freedom in what I decide to write.

2. We are very blessed in Kuwait to enjoy an extremely progressive constitution and laws compared to other countries in the region.

3. Freedom of speech is not absolute - nowhere in the world. There will always be consequences for what you say.

Twitter posts

Question: Do I have the right to speak about anything I would like on Twitter and be protected from being accused of a crime because of "freedom of speech" under the Kuwaiti constitution?

Fajer: As I mentioned above, freedom of speech is not absolute. The constitution states in Article 36 that "freedom of opinion and of scientific research shall be guaranteed. Every person shall have the right to express and propagate his opinion verbally, in writing or otherwise, in accordance with the conditions and procedures specified by law". The constitution, as it should, grants everyone the right to express their feelings and opinions, but clearly states that this should be in accordance with procedures set out in the law.

There are plenty of crimes that can happen on a social media account, regardless if the law mentions that the crime has to happen on social media or not. For example, you can be penalized for swearing at someone or for promoting hate, even if the articles for those crimes do not mention where the crime has to be committed. A crime on Twitter or any other social media is seen as if the crime happened in Kuwait if the person behind the account is living in Kuwait.

We might not understand what power we have to influence others through social media. Remember that even though you should always be able to share your opinions and feelings, don't forget to try to be respectful to others, regardless of what the law states.

KOC said in a statement that the West Al-Rawdatain station is the second of three similar stations, which are operating in January and will contribute to increase the production of free gas and light oil gradually.

The third and final station is expected to be operated in east Al-Rawdatin in the coming months, and the production of free gas during the first quarter of the next fiscal year will reach 500 million cubic feet per day, while light oil

production is expected to rise by 200,000 barrels per day by the same period, the statement added.

The CEO of Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) Nizar al-Adassani and deputy CEO attended the opening of the station for South and East Kuwait at KOC Abdullah Al-Sumaiti and a number of senior officials from the company. Minister Al-Rashidi toured on the sidelines of the opening accompanied by Al-Adassani and KOC officials on some of the projects under construction in northern Kuwait, the tour included a visit to the 29th gathering center in the Al-Rawdatain field and Al-Sabriya gas production station, which opened earlier this month. — KUNA

Turkey intensifies Syria campaign

Campaign strains relations with United States

HASSA: Turkey yesterday stepped up its offensive against Kurdish militia in Syria for a ninth, in a campaign that has strained relations with the United States. After several days of poor visibility because of heavy rain and fog, Turkish warplanes and artillery took advantage of the clear skies and pounded the hill of Barsaya near the Kurdish town of Afrin in northwestern Syria, official news agency Anadolu said. Turkey launched operation "Olive Branch" on January 20 against the Syrian Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG) in Afrin, supporting Syrian opposition fighters with ground troops and air strikes. While Turkey brands the YPG a "terror" group, the militia has received support from the US, its fighters spearheading the battle against the Islamic State group across swathes of Syria

Despite souring relations with NATO ally Washington, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has threatened to expand the offensive against the YPG to Manbij, east of Afrin. And in a sign the Turkish campaign has rendered prospects for peace in Syria even fainter, authorities in the war-torn country's Kurdish autonomous region said they will not attend peace talks in Russia's Sochi. "We said before that if the situation remained the same in Afrin we could not attend Sochi," regional official Fawza Al-Yussef said. Rebel backer Turkey is one of the sponsors of the talks in the Black Sea resort on Monday and Tuesday, along with Damascus allies Russia and Iran.

Towers of smoke

Turkey's air and artillery strikes yesterday were even fiercer than previous days, said an AFP correspondent on the Syrian-Turkish border who saw towers of smoke rising into the sky. Turkish channel NTV broadcast live footage yesterday showing rocket fire targeting Barsaya hill, located to the

strategic border town of Azaz. "I spoke earlier with a commander who said: 'With God's help, we will take over Barsaya very soon," Erdogan said in a speech in Corum in northern Turkey. Turkish troops and their

Syrian opposition allies said Monday they had captured the hill, before losing it again a few hours later. Yesterday's battles "are very fierce on Barsaya ... which is strategic

because it overlooks Azaz on the Syrian side and Kilis on the Turkish side", Syrian Observatory for Human Rights director Rami Abdel Rahman said. "Today's clashes are more intense," he added.

US-Turkish relations soured

Turkish relations with the US have dipped over their stances on the YPG-which Ankara says is a "terrorist" offshoot of the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK). The PKK, which has waged a war against the Turkish state for three decades, is proscribed as a terror

Adding fuel to the fire, Turkey's Foreign Minister Mevlut Cavusoglu on Saturday urged the US to "immediately withdraw"

its personnel from Kurdish-held Manbij, which Ankara has also threatened to attack. "We are going to cleanse Manbij" after Afrin, government spokesman Bekir Bozdag said yesterday, according to Anadolu. Manbij was retaken from IS by the Kurdish-led Syrian Democratic Forces in 2016 as part of a push that would later recapture the city of Raqa from the jihadists.

Five Turkish troops killed

Faced with the Turkish onslaught, the YPG's political arm the Kurdish Democratic Union Party (PYD) appealed to the international community to pressure Ankara into halting its offensive. Five Turkish soldiers have died since "Olive Branch" was launched, while around 40 others have been injured. One soldier who was killed Saturday will be laid to rest later in Istanbul. The fighting has also led to a heavy loss of civilian lives.

According to the Britain-based Observatory, 42 civilians have been killed since January 20, including 12 children, most of them in Turkish air strikes. Ankara denies shelling any civilian areas. In a sign of the sheer ferocity of the fighting, 69 pro-Turkish rebels were killed, as were 66 Kurdish fighters. Earlier this month, the US-led coalition fighting IS said it was working to create a 30,000-strong border security force in northern Syria, which would include the YPG. Several nations, including Germany and France, as well as the European Union, have expressed concern over the Turkish offensive against a country where over 340,000 people have already been killed since war erupted in 2011.—AFP

Who are Haqqanis, Afghanistan's most feared insurgents?

ISLAMABAD: Afghanistan yesterday blamed a devastating suicide bomb attack in Kabul that killed at least 95 people and wounded 158 others on the Taleban-affiliated Haqqani Network, former CIA assets now considered one of the most dangerous factions fighting US-led NATO forces in Afghanistan. Led by Sirajuddin Haqqani, who doubles as the Afghan Taleban's deputy leader, the extremist group has been blamed for spectacular attacks across Afghanistan since after the US invasion. Long suspected of links to Pakistan's shadowy military establishment, the network was described by US Admiral Mike Mullen in 2011 as a "veritable arm" of Pakistani intelligence. "When you hear US officials, including in private settings, talking about what worries them the most, they always talk about the Haqqanis," said analyst Michael Kugelman, of the Wilson Center in Washington.

Who are they?

The group was founded by Jalaluddin Haqqani, an Afghan mujahideen commander fighting the Soviet occupation of Afghanistan in the 1980s with the help of the US and Pakistan. Jalaluddin gained notoriety for his organization and bravery, garnering attention from the CIA and a personal visit from US congressman Charlie Wilson. A fluent Arabic speaker, Jalaluddin also fostered close ties with Arab jihadists including Osama Bin Laden who flocked to the region during the war. Later, Jalaluddin became a minister in the Taleban regime.

Now designated a terrorist group by the US, the Haqqanis are known for their heavy use of suicide bombers. They were blamed for the truck bomb in the heart of Kabul in May that killed around 150 people-though Sirajuddin later denied the accusation in a rare audio message. The network has also been accused of assassinating top Afghan officials and holding kidnapped Westerners for ransom. That includes recently released Canadian Joshua Boyle, his American wife Caitlan Coleman, and their three children-all born in captivity-as well as US soldier Bowe Bergdahl, who was released in 2014.

Where are they now?

Following the US invasion of Afghanistan, Taleban fighters

flooded across the border into Pakistan, where they regrouped before launching an insurgency against the Americans. That included the Haqqanis, who coordinated attacks on NATO from across the border in their stronghold of Miran Shah, the biggest town in North Waziristan, one of Pakistan's semi-autonomous border tribal areas. The US has launched repeated drone attacks targeting the group while Pakistan's military has conducted successive clearing operations, though skeptical Afghan officials have noted they always seemed to miss the Haqqanis. Pakistan intensified a military operation in the area in 2014, however, and some militant sources say the pressure has forced many of the Haqqanis underground or over the border into their Afghan strongholds, claims that AFP could not confirm.

Linked to Pakistan?

Pakistan sees its arch-nemesis to the east, India, as an existential threat, and has long sought influence over Kabul as a bulwark against Delhi. The Haqqanis have frequently been accused of targeting Indian installations in Afghanistan, spurring speculation they were overseen by Pakistani intelligence agencies. "For Pakistan the calculus comes down to India," said Kugelman. "It views the Haqqanis and also more broadly the Afghan Taleban as a useful asset to help push back against the presence of India in Afghanistan." Politicians and retired military officials in Islamabad acknowledge privately that having open channels with the Haqqanis is vital. Some stressed the nature of the connection. "There's a difference between contact and supporting them or being part of them," Mehmood Shah, a retired brigadier who worked in Pakistan's tribal areas said.

What does US want?

Washington has long pressured Pakistan to crack down on militant groups, with the Haqqanis a top priority. US President Donald Trump turned up the heat last summer when he accused Pakistan of playing a double game in Afghanistan and upbraided Islamabad for sheltering "agents of chaos". Islamabad has repeatedly denied the claims and accused Washington of ignoring the thousands of Pakistani lives lost in its struggle with militancy. The recovery of Boyle, Coleman, and their children came weeks later, with Pakistan using its role in securing their freedom to urge the US to trust it is doing its best. But-Pakistan's desire for strategic depth aside-a crackdown on the Haqqanis might not be easy in a tribal society where social relations matter, warned Pakistani political analyst Imtiaz Gul. "You can't simply pluck out somebody because they've gone politically incorrect," he said.—AFP

Paris on alert as Seine swells



PARIS: The swollen Seine rose even higher yesterday, keeping Paris on alert, though forecasters said the flooding should peak by the end of the day. The river had risen 11 centimeters in 24 hours by Saturday evening, more than four meters above its normal height, causing headaches for commuters as well as people living near its overflowing banks. Tourists suffered too with the capital's famous Bateaux Mouches rivercraft out of service, and only emergency services authorized to navigate the Seine. The Vigicrues flooding agency forecasts the river will peak at 5.95 meters overnight, not quite reaching the 2016 high of 6.1 meters, when the Louvre museum was forced to shut for four days.

But the world's most visited museum was on high alert yesterday, along with the Musee d'Orsay and Orangerie galleries, with the lower level of the Louvre's Islamic arts wing closed to visitors at least until today. A statue of an Algerian French army soldier from the Crimean War named Zouave that has guarded the river at the Pont d'Alma bridge in central Paris since 1910 was drenched up to the thighs in the muddy waters of the Seine. Police again warned Parisians against bathing or canoeing in the river, saying it was "forbidden and extremely dangerous".

Flooding to recede 'slowly'

More favorable weather is expected for the week ahead, and Vigicrues has lowered its warning level from orange to yellow in several areas upstream of the capital. But even once the water

levels start to recede, forecasters and officials say it will be a slow process, since much of the ground in northern France is already waterlogged. "If we're talking about things getting completely back to normal, that's going to take weeks," said Jerome Goellner, regional head of environmental services. Around 1,000 people have been evacuated from their homes in the greater Paris region, according to police, while around 1,500 homes were without electricity. Some basements in Paris began to see leaks on Friday, and a health centre in the city's northwestern suburbs, where 86 patients were receiving care, was evacuated because of flooding.

Neighborhoods under water

The December-January period is now the third wettest on record since data collection began in 1900, according to France's meteorological service. However, fears of flooding like that of 1910, which saw the Seine rise to 8.62 meters, shutting down much of Paris's basic infrastructure, appeared unfounded. A main commuter line, the RER C, has halted service at Paris stops indefinitely, and some expressways that run alongside the Seine have been closed. In Paris the Seine flows through a deep channel, limiting the potential flooding damage to riverside structures. But several areas on the city's outskirts are under water, such as the southern suburb of Villeneuve-Saint-Georges, where some residents were getting around by boat and dozens have been evacuated from their homes.—AFP

5 killed in bomb attack at Colombian police station

Alleged drug traffickers detonate a bomb

BOGOTA: At least five police officers were killed and 41 others wounded Saturday when alleged drug traffickers detonated a bomb at a station in the northern city of Barranquilla, hours after a car explosion ripped through a security post near the border in neighboring Ecuador. There was no apparent link between the two attacks, but they come as President Juan Manuel Santos seeks to end the armed conflict that has wracked Colombia for 50 years. Much of the violence has been linked to drug trafficking. The bombing in Barranquilla was one of the deadliest on security personnel in recent years, casting a pall over preparations for the annual carnival, a major attraction in the bustling Caribbean port city.

Barranquilla police commander Mariano Botero said the bomb detonated as the officers gathered for morning formation. A police source told AFP that 49 officers were at the site when the bomb exploded. Of those, five officers aged between 24 and 31 were killed and 41 were wounded. A 31-year-old man was arrested on suspicion of

carrying out the attack, according to Attorney General Liberation Army (ELN) guerrillas. Nestor Martinez. "We will charge (him) with five aggravated murders... attempted murder, terrorism and use of explosives," Martinez told a press conference.

Barranquilla Mayor Alejandro Char quickly blamed drug traffickers for the attack. "I do not have the slightest doubt that this is a retaliation" for successful police action against drug traffickers, he told reporters. Botero also suggested that the attack could be in revenge after a police

crackdown on local drug traffickers. Colombia is the world's top producer of cocaine, and criminal groups have flooded the country's main cities with drugs in a move known as "microtrafficking." President Juan Manuel Santos blasted the "cowardly attack" on Twitter. "We will not rest until we find those responsible, my solidarity is with the families of the victims and the wounded," Santos wrote.

Joining Santos was the presidential candidate of the FARC, the former guerrilla group which is now a leftist political party. Rodrigo "Timochenko" Londono "vehemently" condemned the Barranquilla attack. "All our solidarity is for the relatives of the slain police," he wrote on

Twitter. Santos reached a historic peace agreement with the FARC-formerly known as Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia-in November 2016. That led to the rebels' disarmament and transformation into a political party. The president, who is set to step down in August, is hoping to reach a similar agreement with the smaller

7 football fans shot dead

MONTERREY: At least seven people watching a football match have been shot dead in Mexico, sources said Saturday, adding to the country's murder toll which last year hit a two-decade high. The latest killings-after more than 25,000 last year-happened in Monterrey, an industrial hub in the country's northeast. At least four hooded gunmen entered a home in the city and threatened about 20 people watching the football, a source at the local prosecutor's office said. Some were herded to a bathroom where they were gunned down, the source said, citing witnesses. Like much of Mexico, Monterrey has been afflicted by drug violence in recent years. In 2006 the government launched a controversial military anti-drug operation which critics say has only led to more murders and attacks.

Suicide bomber kills 4

BAMAKO: A suicide bomber killed four Malian soldiers yesterday, the army said, in the second deadly attack this weekend in the country's troubled north. Mali's deteriorating security situation is of growing concern as Al-Qaeda-linked groups mount increasingly ferocious attacks on domestic and foreign forces. "A terrorist suicide bomber was destroyed this morning, yesterday in Menaka as he attempted to blow himself up on the approach to an army and national guard post," a statement by the armed forces posted on social media said. "Unfortunately during this operation, four armed forces personnel lost their lives," it added.

France to overhaul the baccalaureate in tricky school reform

PARIS: For over two centuries French students have faced a grueling rite of passage: the week-long high school exit exam and its infamous philosophical essay, which bedevils college hopefuls with stumpers like "Do we always know what we desire?" The philosophy brain-twister will remain, but the government has unveiled proposals for a major revamp of the rest of the baccalaureate, tackling a "national monument" based on a structure created under

Emmanuel Macron pledged to overhaul the Bac, as it is known, during his presidential campaign, saving it was failing to adequately prepare teenagers for university and the modern job market. Once in university, roughly 60 percent of students fail to secure their diplomas marking the first three years of study. The proposed reform presented this week, which would halve the number of Bac tests to just five including a new 30-minute oral exam, aims to orientate students toward specific degrees sooner. The three broad subject choices-science, literature or social sciences would also be eliminated.

Before their final year students would choose two specific "major" subjects as well as two "minors" alongside the standard curriculum-a system that will sound familiar to American college graduates. And instead of being based purely on results in the final exams, the new Bac grade would incorporate marks and test results obtained throughout the two final years of school. Even class sched-

ules will change by 2021 if the reforms are passed, with the vear now divided into two semesters instead of three trimesters, and the tests spread over several months instead of a single week.

'Better graduates'

The government hopes that introducing specialization at a younger age will help students better choose their university-where places are currently free and guaranteed to anyone who passes the bac ordeal. For Pierre Mathiot, former president at the Lille branch of the prestigious Sciences Po university who drafted the overhaul, students will be able to secure a high school degree under "more realistic conditions". "I'm not saying there should be fewer

baccalaureates, but that there should be 'better' graduates... and that the average Bac grade should better reflect a student's actual level," he said Thursday. He also argued that it was more forgiving for students, since strong results in one area of the test could make up for lessthan-stellar work elsewhere. The goal is also to save money: mobilizing supervisors and setting up mass testing centers cost the state 57 million euros (\$71 million) last year, French daily Liberation reported. But critics say students will be forced to make career choices at too young an age. And the ideal of scholastic equality is also at risk, they say, since wealthier students will probably be better prepared to navigate the choices now open to them than those in poorer areas. —AFP

Police arrest Navalny at anti-Putin protest as thousands rally

MOSCOW: Russian police yesterday detained opposition leader Alexei Navalny at a rally in Moscow which he had called to protest upcoming polls expected to extend Vladimir Putin's Kremlin term to 2024. Surrounded by supporters, the 41-year-old chanted "Swindlers and thieves" before being detained by police shortly afterwards at an unsanctioned gathering in the city centre amid heavy police presence. "I have been detained," Navalny tweeted. "This means nothing. Come to Tverskaya (Avenue)," he said, referring to Moscow's main thoroughfare. "You are not rallying for me, but for yourselves and your future."

Heeding a call by President Putin's bete noire, thousands rallied in dozens of cities to protest upcoming "pseudo-elections," with many chanting and brandishing placards saying "Voters' strike." Several thousand turned up for the rally in Moscow where authorities dramatically beefed up security, dispatching police vans and passenger buses to the city centre. Around 90 people were detained across the country, according to OVD-Info, an independent group which monitors crackdowns on demonstrations.

"These are not elections because we already know the result. I will not go and vote," Elena Ruzhe, 62, told AFP in central Moscow. "I'm not scared to protest," said the former culture ministry worker. Protester Alexandra Fedorova, who wore a fur coat, said it was wrong not to let Navalny take part in the vote. "I don't see a future. There is nobody to vote for," the 27year-old said.

'Tired of this quagmire'

Protesters expressed similar sentiments in

the second city of Saint Petersburg, the Russian leader's hometown, where at least 1,000 people rallied, some chanting "Russia without Putin" and "Putin is a thief." "I want change," Andrei Petrov, 20 said in the former imperial capital. We are tired of living in this quagmire." Earlier in the day opposition supporters protested in far eastern Russia and Siberia, including in the northern city of Yakutsk where Russians rallied despite temperatures of around minus 45 Celsius. Navalny-seen as the only politician with enough stamina to take on Putin has built a robust protest movement despite constant police harassment, tapping into the anger of a ounger generation yearning for change.

He says the upcoming election will be little more than a coronation of Putin who is expected to win a fourth presidential term and extend his Kremlin stay until 2024. Ahead of the main Moscow rally police broke into Navalny's headquarters using a power saw, interrupting a live broadcast covering the protests in the east of the country. Police also detained several employees of his Anti-Corruption Foundation as well as supporters, Navalny's team said. "If you don't go, you won't forgive yourself later," Navalny's said in a video address before the start of the protest. 'Sooner or later they will cut your door too." Ahead of his detention Navalny said police officers had been watching his residential building and garage. "Police, police, police are everywhere," he added. Putin's spokesman Dmitry Peskov warned earlier this week that unsanctioned rallies would lead to "certain consequences"-a thinly-veiled promise of punishment.

Last year Navalny mounted a forceful bid to run for president but officials ruled him ineligible due to a criminal conviction which he says is politically motivated. Navalny has said he would use the full force of his campaign-including over 200,000 volunteers-to organize "voters' strikes" and encourage Russians to stay away from polling stations on election day. After 18 years of leadership, both as president and prime minister, Putin fatigue is spreading across Russia. The Kremlin's biggest headache is the possibility of a low turnout which will harm Putin's hopes for a strong new mandate, analysts say. Navalny seeks to take the shine off Putin's expected victory and highlight voter apathy in his crusade against the 65-year-old leader. —AFP



KABUL: Kabul reacted in despair and fear yesterday, a day after a suicide bomb killed more than 100 people and wounded at least 235 in the worst attack seen in the Afghan capital in months. There was a mix of helpless anger at the seemingly endless wave of attacks after an ambulance packed with explosives blew up in a crowded city street, with security officials warning that more attacks were possible.

"How are we to live? Where should we go?" asked shopkeeper Mohammad Hanif, who was in his shop near

the site of the explosion when it went off. "We have no security, we don't have no proper government, what should we do?" Interior Minister Wais Barmak said the casualty toll had risen to at least 103 dead and 235 wounded. He said at least two vehicles painted as ambulances were involved in the attack, one of which blew up at when it was stopped at a police checkpoint.



a statement, using the term the use to describe themselves. Trump, who last year sent more American troops to Afghanistan and ordered an increase in air strikes and other assistance to Afghan forces, said the attack "renews our resolve and that of our Afghan partners". The attack was the worst seen in the Afghan capital since a truck bomb near the German embassy killed 150 people in May. "People were running everywhere to escape, there were wounded people lying on the ground, people with wounds to their arms, legs, heads," Hanif said.

After a deadly week in which an office of the aid group Save the Children in the eastern city of Jalalabad was also attacked, President Ashraf Ghani's Western-backed government has faced growing pressure to improve security. Despite a major tightening in checks following the May 31 attack, the ambulance was able to get through the checkpoints, apparently without difficulty. "People don't have work. There's no life for people in Afghanistan. People have to look for a life somewhere else, there's nowhere," said shopkeeper Sameem.

'Resolve'

Pressure is likely to mount on President Ashraf Ghani to resolve political confrontation with his opponents, in particular with provincial powerbrokers defying central rule, and focus on security. "People think the government is working very badly and security is no good," said Najib Mahmood, political science professor at

Kabul University. "The government can control the situation but the president has to share power with others, he needs unity with other parties so they can fight the Taleban together," Mahmood said.

Former US ambassador to Afghanistan Zalmay Khalilzad called for Ghani's government and its main political rival, powerful northern leader Atta Mohammad Noor, to "come together and resolve their differences". "Fighting terrorism and protecting the people is job one. I hope they rise to the occasion," Khalilzad said on Twitter. Saturday's attack, described as "an atrocity" by the head of the UN mission in Afghanistan, drew universal condemnation from neighboring countries and allies who had expressed confidence that the new US strategy is producing results.

Following a recent visit to Kabul, the US ambassador to the United Nations, Nikki Haley, said the strategy was working and pushing the insurgents closer to peace talks. However, the Taleban have dismissed any suggestion that

they have been weakened by the US approach and say they will only agree to talks when international forces leave Afghanistan. The United States, which has accused Pakistan of giving assistance to the Taleban and has cut off some aid, urged all countries to take "decisive action" to stop the violence. Pakistan, which denies the US accusations, condemned the attack and called for "concerted efforts and effective cooperation ... to eradicate the scourge of terrorism".

The attack, in one of the most heavily protected parts of the city, close to foreign embassies and government

buildings, demonstrated that the ability of the Taleban to mount deadly high-profile attacks that undermine confidence in the government remains undiminished. The president's office declared Sunday a day of mourning and said Monday would be a day off to allow care of the victims' families. The office also said Joko Widodo, president of Indonesia, which has the world's biggest Muslim population, was due to visit Kabul on Monday. Widodo has proposed that Indonesian Islamic scholars could help promote Afghan peace, media reported recently.—Reuters

Japan and China to open hotline to ease tensions

BEIJING: China and Japan plan to open a military hotline to ease tensions over disputed East China Sea islands, Beijing said yesterday, after their top diplomats held rare talks aimed at warming chilly ties. Japanese Foreign Minister Taro Kono met his counterpart Wang Yi in Beijing yesterday in an attempt to improve relations held back by long-standing and seemingly intractable disputes over maritime territory and Japan's wartime legacy.

While ties between Tokyo and Beijing have shown signs of warming, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Japanese PM Shinzo Abe have yet to meet on their own soil. Kono's visit to China is the first by a serving Japanese foreign minister in nearly two years. In a statement China's foreign ministry said the two countries had pledged to sign an agreement "as soon as possible" to establish a military hotline to help prevent incidents in the East China Sea.

Frequent maritime patrols by both countries around disputed islets have become a potential flashpoint and a major impediment to improved relations. "China and Japan should work together to build the East China Sea into the sea of peace, cooperation and friendship," it said. In remarks before the talks Kono praised the progress towards improving ties, while calling on China to do more to curb North Korea's nuclear weapons program. "It is important not only to discuss issues related to our two countries, but for Japan and China to stand side by side to deal with global issues," he said. "In particular, the North Korea issue is now an urgent issue for the whole of international society."

'Crucial stage'

Tokyo has been wooing China with official visits and business delegations, but an exchange of state visits has remained a hard sell. Japan is hoping that will change this year as the two countries prepare to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the signing of a Japan-China friendship treaty. The foreign ministry statement from Beijing made no mention of an Abe-Xi meeting.

China's foreign minister Wang also kept his cards close to his chest. Relations between the two countries were at a "crucial stage", he said, adding "there is positive progress, but many disturbances and obstacles remain". A longstanding dispute over islands in the East China Sea-known as the "Senkakus" in Japanese and the "Diaoyu" by the Chinese-remains a source of tension. Tokyo's decision to "nationalize" some of the islets in 2012 led to a major falling out and the relationship has been slow to recover. Chinese coastguard vessels routinely travel around the disputed islands, a practice that has brought regular objections from Japan, which controls the region.

During the meetings, Kono lodged a protest over Beijing's decision earlier this month to send a nuclear-powered submarine to the area, Kyodo News said. Japan is also pushing to host a trilateral summit with leaders from China and South Korea to discuss a broad range of regional issues, including North Korea's nuclear program. The meeting, which was scheduled for last December, was postponed after the impeachment of the then-South Korean president Park Geun-Hye. The two sides agreed the meeting should be held "as soon as possible", China's foreign ministry said without mentioning the venue.—AFP

Traumatized Rohingya kids fear return to Myanmar

COX'S BAZAR: The disturbing drawings of homes engulfed in flames, and stickmen hanging from trees that are produced by Rohingya children in Bangladesh's overcrowded refugee camps are slowly giving way to the flowers and sunny days that psychologists expect from healthy youngsters. But the prospect of returning to Rakhine, where the Myanmar army and Buddhist mobs orchestrated a campaign of ethnic cleansing, could reverse the healing and damage children forever, say experts.

"My friends were slaughtered by the military and Buddhists when we were trying to escape. There were dead bodies everywhere," 12-year-old Sadiya said in a trembling voice, wiping away tears with her headscarf. "If we go back now, they will kill all of us. I don't think we will ever go back. I don't want to." Sadiya is one of the 690,000 Rohingya who have pressed into Bangladesh since last August. Two thirds are children. Thousands arrived alone, many carrying with them a handful of pitiful possessions and graphic stories of seeing their families murdered and their villages burned in an orgy of communal violence.

The United Nations estimates 170,000 children are suffering from some form of mental trauma, having witnessed rape and torture. For months they have lived in the camps that have spread from the riverine border, where desperate conditions have steadily improved. After months of global pressure on Aung San Suu Kyi, Myanmar reached an agreement on November 23 with Bangladesh to take back refugees. The returns were supposed to start this week, but were suddenly shelved, with both sides blaming the other for a lack of preparation.

Nightmares, stress

Aid agencies and experts say that is actually a good thing. "We know the children that are already trauma-

tised and need expert care, will be even more traumatized if they are forced to go back," UNICEF deputy executive director Justin Forsyth told AFP in the Balukhali refugee camp. "Nightmares, wetting their beds, self harming. These are things children begin to do in extreme situations. I mean children shaking with fear because they don't know whether they'll see the same type of violence happening again."

The small army of psychologists working in the camps say repatriation could cause the Rohingya children long-term damage just as they are coming to terms with the relative stability of their new lives. A handful of child-safe zones have sprung up across the camps, offering a respite from the drudgery of survival, where youngsters can play, draw, sing, act and read in safety.

Little is known about what preparations the Myanmar authorities are making, but pictures that emerged this week of processing centers wrapped in razor wire offered a stark contrast. Sirajum Monira, a Bangladeshi govern-

ment clinical psychologist at Kutupalong camp, said returning youngsters was not simply a case of shovelling them back across the border. "The incidents can't be forgotten easily. It is a major incident for their life which will be carried out throughout their life," she said. "After repatriation, going back to their own home, they will need psychological support."

Even before the killing began last August, life was hard for the Rohingya, a minority despised by most Burmese as illegal immigrants-despite many having lived there for generations. Myanmar imposes strict controls on education, freedom of movement and religion in Rakhine, though actual conditions are difficult to verify because the government not allow foreign media or aid groups into the region. Ten-year-old Mohamamad Zubayer, whose father was killed by Buddhist mobs, would prefer to stay where he is. "I don't mind living here forever," he said, saying he particularly enjoyed going to school-something he had not been able to do in Myanmar.—AFP

On the stump at 92: Malaysia's Mahathir woos rural voters

SEKINCHAN: He may be 92 but Malaysia's ex-strongman Mahathir Mohamad has brushed aside the constraints of age to hit the campaign trail for upcoming polls, as he takes on scandal-plagued premier Najib Razak. Mahathir was welcomed by cheering voters at a fishing village on Friday, in a late-night stop as he seeks to woo voters crucial to victory in polls that must be called by August. Such a scene would have been unthinkable until recently-Mahathir was addressing an event organized by an opposition party that fought against his rule during his 22 years in power.

"This time, we have a chance to change the Barisan Nasional (BN) government," the elderly politician thundered, referring to the coalition that has ruled Malaysia since independence in 1957, and which he himself once led. Mahathir was picked as

the opposition coalition's prime ministerial candidate this month, in a political volteface that shook up a race that long looked like an easy win for the government.

His coalition hopes he will win rural votes, particularly those of the Muslim Malay majority, who have long supported the government in exchange for policies favoring them but have become disillusioned due to the rising cost of living and a financial scandal ensnaring Najib. "The critical factor in this election would be Malay voters that are disgruntled," said Ibrahim Suffian, head of independent polling firm Merdeka Centre said.

Mahathir is himself Malay, and has long championed the Malay cause. The opposition hopes the votes he peels away from the government will complement their traditional support base of people in the cities and minorities, particularly the ethnic Chinese. Analysts do not expect the opposition to win due to BN's dominance of the political system, but if the unlikely happens, Mahathir will become the world's oldest prime minister.

Rapid return

Mahathir stepped down as premier in 2003, but he did not stay away from politics for long. He came out of retirement to challenge his ex-protege Najib over alle-

gations state fund 1MDB had been plundered, formed a party in 2016 and aligned with the opposition. The most remarkable aspect of his political rebirth has been a reconciliation with former nemesis Anwar Ibrahim. The pair met for the first time in 18 years in 2016 when Mahathir turned up to show support for Anwar at a court appear-

ance. Anwar was heir apparent to Mahathir until the premier sacked him in 1998 over political differences, and he was then jailed on sodomy and corruption charges. The opposition Coalition of Hope had qualms about making Mahathir their candidate for the top job but observers say there was ultimately little choice. —AFP

Measles? Bring it on, says US 'vaccine choice' movement

oe Accurso, a 47-year-old chiropractor, refused to vaccinate his daughter against polio, measles or whooping cough because he believes that getting sick wouldn't be dangerous and might even be good for her. "I am actually disappointed that she doesn't have the opportunity to get the chicken pox, to get diseases that make her body stronger in the future. That is our big reason," he told AFP. Don't call them "anti-vaxxers." Joe and his wife Cathy, a physical therapist, see themselves as part of a vocal minority that believes in "vaccine choice".

These parents - many of whom are white, educated and upper middle class - choose not to immunize their children against diseases which collectively used to kill millions children per year around the world. They say these illnesses aren't so bad, compared to vaccines, the risks of which they believe are being withheld from the public in the name of pharmaceutical profits - a belief now shared by millions of people across the developed world, from the United States to Europe and Australia.

They are also swayed by purported medical whistle-blowers who claim that vaccine effectiveness data has been skewed, that vaccine injuries are on the rise, and that dubious ingredients have been concealed. Fueled by distrust of the medical establishment, more than seven million people follow various US-based Facebook pages that question vaccines, wrote Richard Stein, a New York University cardiologist, last month in the journal Germs. "Conspiracy theories on social media are alive and thriving, rejoicing their golden age," Stein said.

Resurgence of measles

Endemic measles was eradicated from the United States in 2000, and nationwide only about two percent of kindergarteners have gone unvaccinated in recent years, according to the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). But the danger comes when large pockets of people do not vaccinate and an area loses "herd immunity". In Minnesota, for example, child vaccination rates for measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) in the Somali-American community plummeted to 42 percent in 2014, down from 92 percent in 2004. The result: 65 cases of measles in 2017, most of them unvaccinated Somali children - the largest single outbreak in a year that saw 120 cases nationwide, the CDC said.

Fears about autism spread after British anti-vaccine activist Andrew Wakefield - whose 1998 research alleging that vaccines trigger autism was found to be fraudulent - spoke to local Somali community groups in 2010 and 2011. "One of the pseudoscience phony central tenets of the anti-vax movement is to claim that measles is a benign illness or even good for you," Peter Hotez, director of the Texas Children's Hospital Center for Vaccine Development, told AFP. Such ideas are "deliberately misleading and false," and have real-world consequences, he added.

Measles can cause hearing loss, blindness, brain swelling and pneumonia. The CDC says that for every 1,000 children infected, one or two will die. In the United States, recent measles outbreaks include one in Ohio's Amish community in 2014 (383 cases), and a nationwide 2015 outbreak that infected 188 and is believed to have started with a visitor to California's Disneyland amusement park. A vaccinated elderly woman was the sole measles fatality that year.

Influence of social media

Social media may be perpetuating the anti-vaccine movement, said Naomi Smith, an Australian researcher. Smith just completed a three-year study on how Facebook appears to have created a "filter bubble" around the fraught issue - so vaccine skeptics see their ideas reinforced on pages they follow. When it comes to convincing hesitant parents to vaccinate their kids,

Smith said both sides are at "a total impasse".

People who hold strong anti-vaccination beliefs tend to believe personal testimonies, and "use a different standard of evidence than what the medical community uses," she told AFP. To bridge the divide, some doctors, like Arizona pediatrician Tim Jacks, occasionally share their own personal stories with vaccine-hesitant parents. In 2015, Jacks' daughter Maggie was battling leukemia, had recently finished a round of chemotherapy, and was exposed to measles while getting blood drawn at a Phoenix clinic. Also exposed was his younger son, Eli, just 10 months old then and too

young for the MMR shot.

The experience was scary, and required the family to spend two weeks in quarantine. Fortunately neither child fell ill, and Maggie, now six, is in remission from her cancer. "We don't live in bubbles. So even going to the store and getting groceries, going to church, going to the park, you are interacting with other people and you are potentially exposing other people," Jacks said. "Who is really at risk? It is the family that has a newborn that has no protection. It is the grandmas."

For Hotez, solutions include more engagement from scientists and laws that eliminate the personal choice to vaccinate, as now exist in 18 states. After the Disneyland outbreak, California changed its laws to allow only medical exemptions for children who attend school, and vaccinations climbed. "It is no longer simply a small cult," said Hotez. "This is a well-organized movement that needs to be taken on directly." —AFP



Onwards and upwards for mighty Federer

Roger Federer continued to rewrite his remarkable script with what was previously thought an unattainable 20th Grand Slam title yesterday, and he appears to have no plans to slow down any time soon. The 36-year-old Swiss marvel defied the years and attrition rate to claim a joint-record sixth Australian crown in his 30th Grand Slam decider in Melbourne on Saturday, beating Croatia's Marin Cilic in five tough sets.

It put him alongside contemporary rival Novak Djokovic and Australian great Roy Emerson with the most Australian titles. Worryingly for his opponents, the ageless star is enjoying himself as much as ever, and that inevitably means he plans to stick around for some time yet. "I'm happy I'm still around, still healthy, still playing good, giving myself chances, playing the best," he said last week. "It's almost good fun."

Just when many people thought his Grand Slam-winning days were behind him having not won a major title since Wimbledon in 2012, Federer has now reeled off another three since his 35th birthday. And there appears every likelihood of more to come, particularly a ninth Wimbledon crown later this year. While he makes it look easy, it doesn't come without a tough grind behind the scenes, as Federer explained earlier in the tournament. "There's always a lot of work that goes into it during the tournament, focus, and also preparation beforehand." he said.

"For many weeks and months before, you try to put yourself in the position, are you going to be ready in case a good semi-finals or quarter-finals match at the Australian Open, so forth. This is something you sort of plan from a long time ago. That's why when it does happen, it's a great feeling."

How much it means was evident with Federer in tears at the presentation ceremony yesterday. And all of this with two sets of twins to look after with wife Mirka - Myla Rose and Charlene Riva and Leo and Lenny. A fit and healthy Federer chalking up yet another major title coincided with his long-time rivals, Rafael Nadal, Djokovic, Stan Wawrinka and Andy Murray, beginning the year with injury concerns.

Record-setter

Age certainly has not wearied the Swiss master as he was the oldest man at 36 to play in the Australian Open final since Australians Ken Rosewall (37) and Mal Anderson (36) faced each in the 1972 final. The result is that he stretched his lead on the all-time major-winners' list to 20 - four ahead of Nadal, six in front of Pete Sampras and eight more than Djokovic. Only three women - Steffi Graf (22), Serena Williams (23), and Margaret Court (24) - have been crowned champion at more Slams.

In an endless list of records, he also holds the all-time men's record of 332 Grand Slam wins since playing his first in 1999, with career earnings of more than US\$115 million. Saturday's victory was also his 96th career title as he closes in on Jimmy Connors' Open-Era mark of 109. Federer, who spent a record 302 weeks at number one and was inside the top 10 from 2002 until 2015, saw his ranking slide to 17 - his lowest since 2001 - after he spent six months out in 2016 with a knee injury. But it has been all upside since last year's classic five-set final win over Nadal at the Australian Open. Despite his latest endeavor, Federer will remain world No. 2 behind Nadal for now. —AFP



Papua's measles outbreak shows years of neglect

Indonesia's battle to stem a deadly measles outbreak striking malnourished children in Papua is doomed to be repeated unless the government helps lift the isolated region out of grinding poverty, observers said. Some 800 children have fallen ill and as many as 100 others, mostly toddlers, are feared to have died in what Jakarta called an "extraordinary" outbreak that was first made public this month.

AFP reporters obtained rare access to an overwhelmed hospital in Agats, one of the worst-affected communities, witnessed rail-thin children with exposed rib cages lying on rickety beds or wandering foul-smelling hall-ways. One malnourished girl, hooked up to an IV drip, was seen lying on the floor of an underequipped hospital. The disease has proven especially deadly here as malnutrition makes children more susceptible, weakening their immune systems.

Indonesian President Joko Widodo has ordered military and medical teams to bring supplies to remote villages in the far-flung province. Observers blame the crisis on a complex mix of government inaction, lack of jobs, logistical hurdles in reaching remote communities and resettlement efforts that pose a serious threat to traditional hunting-based lifestyles. A low-level separatist insurgency is also simmering in the region, fuelled by resentment over poor conditions and a fight for a bigger share of Papua's rich natural resources.

Many Papuans live a semi-nomadic life in hard-to-reach areas of the jungle with almost no proper medical care, schools or other services, including access to clean water. In Ayam village, a ten-hour boat ride from the nearest major city, a tiny clinic lacked almost everything - including doctors - as its few nurses struggled to treat more than two dozen measles cases. Some locals worry what will happen when the medics leave. "What we really need is medicine and

food so our children here can be healthy again," said 28-year-old father Yunus Komenemar, whose one-year-old son has measles. "The government is paying more attention, aid is coming in and there are (positive) changes, but we want it to last."

Some 12,000 children with no symptoms have been treated, including with vaccinations, according to the health ministry, but in the past many Papuans have refused the shots that are seen as key to preventing outbreaks.

'Isolation'

Indonesia has opened new district governments across Papua and tried to settle locals into permanent villages, but many of the new offices are not equipped to handle the huge task ahead. And resettlement forces locals to adapt to a new lifestyle including adjusting to imported foods that are often already expired by the time they arrive on the island shared with Papua New Guinea, observers said. Complicating matters, many Papuans avoid the province's few medical clinics because they do not think they need treatment, while some avoid larger communities for fear of coming into contact with Indonesia's military, which has been blamed for human rights abuses.

for human rights abuses.

Natalius Pigai, a former senior official at Indonesia's government-backed National Human Rights Commission, warned that the future of Papua and its people was at stake. "To stop (crises) from happening again in the future, we need to stop Papua's isolation," he said. While some new plantations offer hope for the local economy, most workers are not native Papuans, experts said.

Jakarta took control of western Papua after hundreds of years of Dutch colonial rule and a UN-backed self-determination referendum in 1969 that was regarded by many historians as a sham, leading to long-simmering tensions. When Widodo took office in 2014, he vowed to speed up infrastructure development and services, bolstering hopes for the region, observers said. "What the government is saying is what we think is important to do (for Papua) is in fact not being done," said Richard Chauvel, a Papua expert at the University of Melbourne's Asia Institute. —AFP

Ukraine overcomes jab fears amid measles outbreak

chools have shuttered and some clinics exhausted their vaccine stocks as a deadly measles outbreak hits Ukraine, where anti-vaccine sentiment and interrupted supplies have led to a resurgence of the virus. Parents, including those who for years refused vaccinations for their children, are queuing at clinics after schools extended their holidays or refused to let unvaccinated students attend lessons. In a public children's hospital in central Kiev, the door slammed constantly as concerned parents rushed in. "We vaccinated 150 children (in a single day)... This is three to four times more than we usually do," said Oksana Gutova, head of the hospital where staff now have to work overtime and weekends. A pediatrician from a private medical center in Kiev said all but three of his 15 patients on a recent Saturday had come for immunization. "We have exhausted our stock of measles, mumps and rubella vaccines for three months in two days," he told AFP. In 2017, almost 4,800 cases of measles and five fatalities were recorded in the former Soviet republic. Since the start of this year, close to 2,100 Ukrainians have already been infected and three of them died, including two children. In principle, vaccinations against certain infections are mandatory in Ukraine but there is no punishment for non-compliance.

False certificates

Ukrainian authorities and international organizations blame the outbreak on a lengthy hiatus in immunizations, caused by public resistance to vaccines fanned by news reports and rumors. Changes to the system of buying medicines from abroad also led to interrupted supplies in 2015-16. Just 42 percent of one-year-olds had been vaccinated against measles in Ukraine by the end of 2016 - making it the world's third-worst performing country after South Sudan and Equatorial Guinea, according to the UN's children's agency UNICEE.

Although the rate shot up to 93 percent

the following year, based on latest figures from Kiev, this has not made up for the shortfall of the previous years. "We are making progress - but we are not there yet," Giovanna Barberis, UNICEF representative in Ukraine, said in a written comment to AFP. The World Health Organization (WHO) recommends a 98-percent vaccination rate to prevent mass hospitalizations and fatalities, Barberis said.

The official vaccination rate from Kiev should also be interpreted with caution, she added, as there is a widespread practice in Ukraine of buying fake medical certificates to confirm a non-existent vaccination. According to a study conducted in 2016, 52 percent of health workers have reported that they had been asked for fake vaccination certificates, the UNICEF official said.


Diphtheria could be next

The country has already experienced several measles outbreaks, with the worst one affecting more than 40,000 people in 2006. In response, the authorities launched an immunization campaign, but it ran into trouble after the death of a teenager in 2008 who had received an India-made vaccine not certified in Ukraine. The case fuelled public distrust despite an official probe concluding the death was not caused by the vaccine.

Faced with the current outbreak, authorities in the southern Odessa region where all the most recent fatalities have been recorded - decided to extend school holidays for at least two weeks in some districts. The Kiev City Council for its part recommended schools and kindergartens ban unvaccinated children from attending lessons. The announcement drove many parents to immunize their children immediately.

Among them was Oleksandra Filatova, a mother of five who came to a clinic with her two youngest daughters, aged five and ten. "I've heard all kinds of terrible stories about children who were paralyzed, who stopped talking," she told AFP, explaining why she had never had her children vaccinated for fear of complications. But the risk of seeing her children catching measles or missing out on school made Filatova change her mind. She said they would also get jabs for tetanus, diphtheria and whooping cough.—AFP

Dagher said events there were headed towards "total military confrontation" and urged coalition members, in particular the UAE, to act. He also warned that separating south Yemen from the rest of the country would benefit the rebels and Iran, which was "trying to consolidate its presence in Yemen through the Houthis".

Yesterday's rally was called by the Southern Transitional Council, an autonomous body aimed at overseeing self-governance among southern provinces. The 26-member council, which is not recognized by Hadi's government, includes the governors of five southern provinces and two cabinet ministers. Former Aden governor Aidarous Al-Zoubeidi formed the council in May after Hadi fired him. The council had asked Hadi to make changes in the government and gave him one week to do so - a deadline that expired yesterday. It had warned that if Hadi did not accept the demand, its supporters would begin a protest campaign to oust Dagher's government.

A top military adviser to President Hadi, Mohammed Ali Al-Miqdashi, said any move toward rebellion would render the southerners an enemy. "There is no difference between the Houthis and anyone else who rebels bedoons have been forced to sign declarations that specify they hold certain nationalities.

Meanwhile, the public prosecution yesterday submitted its memorandum regarding the opposition activists who have been handed heavy jail terms for storming the Assembly in 2011. The move will enable the court of cassation to start looking into the case by first deciding whether the activists who have been in jail for two months should be freed or not while the court hears the case. Two of those jailed are MPs Jamaan Al-Harbash and Waleed Al-Tabtabaei.

Four years later, it launched a separatist rebellion that culminated in its occupation by northern forces.

The Houthis, a northern Shiite minority, seized Sanaa in Sept 2014 with the help of Saleh and army units loyal to him. In March 2015, the rebels advanced on Aden, where Hadi took refuge after escaping from Sanaa. But the Saudi-led coalition helped pro-Hadi forces oust the rebels from Aden and four other provinces in July that year. Hadi loyalists have been boosted by the Popular Resistance alliance of southern separatists and tribesmen after the rebels advanced on their regions.

Years of UN-backed peace efforts have failed to resolve Yemen's conflict, which has killed more than 9,200 people and devastated a country already among the region's poorest. The Houthis have increasingly consolidated their grip on Sanaa and the north, especially since rebels killed Saleh in December after their alliance collapsed. — Agencies

Ikea's revolutionary self-assembly model - which would cut transport and storage costs - was conceived in 1956 after an employee suggested table legs be removed so the package would fit into a car.

Two years later Kamprad opened Ikea's first store in Almhult, south of his hometown. From 1970, Ikea conquered major markets in Europe, North America, Asia and the Middle East, thriving on the spending power of the emerging middle class in countries like post-Cold War Russia. The Ikea group now has 403 stores across every continent, employs 190,000 people worldwide and generates annual sales of €38 billion (\$47 billion).

But Kamprad lived modestly, buying his clothes at thrift shops, driving an ageing Volvo, and bringing a lunch box to work. "I don't think I'm wearing anything that wasn't bought at a flea market. It means that I want to set a good example," he told Swedish channel TV4 in 2016. In 2013, he was forced to hand over billions of dollars to his sons following a bitter family feud over intellectual property income that he kept for himself, according to a book on Ikea.

Kamprad's success has also been marked by controversy. In 1973 he fled Sweden's higher tax structure for Denmark before seeking even lower taxes in Switzerland. Kamprad announced in 2013 that he would be stepping down from the board of Inter Ikea, owner of the furniture giant's concept and brand, and his youngest son became chairman. The Ikea founder returned to Sweden the following year.

The European Commission announced last year that it had launched an investigation into the ways Ikea allegedly used a Dutch subsidiary to slash its tax bill on revenue from megastores around the world. A report by the Green party in European Parliament last year said Ikea avoided one billion euros (\$1.2 billion) in EU taxes between 2009 to 2014. And the Consortium of Investigative Journalists in 2014 cited leaked tax files from Luxembourg when it identified Ikea as one of the giant multinationals fingered for corporate tax avoidance by shuffling money to tax havens. The group insists that it complies fully with national and international tax regulations.

Kamprad faced harsh criticism in the past for his ties to the Nazi youth movement during World War II. Sweden was neutral in World War II, and its Nazi party remained active after 1945. But Kamprad said he stopped attending its meetings in 1948, later attributing the period to the "folly of youth", calling it "the greatest mistake of my life". — AFP

Wild Tiger Woods battles to two-under 70 at Torrey Pines

LA JOLLA: Tiger Woods was all over the map Saturday, but the 14-time major champion managed to salvage a two-under par 70 in the third round of the Farmers Insurance Open. "I didn't hit it worth a darn all day," said Woods, who was playing the weekend of a US PGA Tour event for the first time since August of 2015. "I was really struggling out there, trying to find anything that was resem-

blance of a golf swing.

"But I was scoring. I was chipping, putting. I was grinding," added Woods, who hit just three of 14 fairways on the Torrey Pines South Course, where his eight wins include his 14th and most recent major title at the 2008 US Open. Some deft work around the greens, four birdie putts ranging from a tap-in to a

ranging from a tap-in to a 15-footer, and a few clutch par-saving putts in the bargain saw Woods finish with a three-under par total of 213 — eight shots off the lead held by Sweden's Alex

Noren, a nine-time winner on the European Tour, rolled in a 38-foot eagle putt at the sixth, and after a double-bogey at the 12th he grabbed three birdies in his last six holes. That included a two-putt birdie at 18 which capped a three-under par 69 for 11-under 205.

"I got it around in three-under, which I was happy about," Noren said. "I hit a lot of greens. Made a mistake there on 12, made a double. It's a tough hole but a double felt pretty rough after just lipping out the hole before and having good chances.

"So I'm happy coming back from that." He was one

stroke in front of Ryan Palmer, the first-round leader who bogeyed 14 and 16 to fall back with a one-over 73 for 206. Defending champion Jon Rahm, his eye on Dustin Johnson's world number one ranking, was in the mix, but a double-bogey seven at the 18th left him sharing 12th, four shots off the pace.

SHORT GAME AND HEART

While the likes of Noren, Palmer and Rahm jockeyed for the lead in relative quiet, Woods again attracted a large and boisterous gallery. "I haven't had people yelling like that in a while," Woods said. "I've played well here over the course of my career and I think a lot of these fans just want to see some of that. And trust me, I'm trying."

The 42-year-old superstar is making his return to the PGA Tour for the first time since missing the cut at Torrey Pines last year. He had missed all of 2016 battling back trouble, and last year's comeback bid was cut short by recurring pain and spinal fusion surgery in April. Woods, who says he's playing without pain for the first time in years, was trending in the right direction, with rounds of 72-71-70. "It would be nice to shoot something in the 60s," Woods said. "I would like to do something a little bit easier than I did today, hit some more fairways, more greens, make it more conventional."

Woods's fused spine got a workout as he repeatedly hit out of dense rough. "I was trying to miss the ball on the correct sides because I knew I didn't have it,"

he said. "Trying to give myself the correct angles and I did that most of the day."

But Woods said he's still struggling with his "feels" as he adjusts to tournament play with his less flexible

fused spine.

"Some of my go-to shots aren't there," he said. "The only thing I have is my short game and my heart-and that got me through today."— AFP

Ginting defeats Sakai to win Indonesian Masters

JAKARTA: Indonesian shuttler Anthony Sinisuka Ginting defeated Japan's Kazumasa Sakai 21-13, 21-12 to win the Indonesian Masters badminton final yesterday. Ginting, 21, was in commanding form in front of a boisterous home crowd at Jakarta's Istora Senayan Stadium, seizing the title after 33 minutes of play. The 27-year-old Sakai, who overcame world number one Viktor Axelsen of Denmark on his way to the final, put in a gutsy effort but was no match for the quick-footed

"Thank God, I'm really grateful to be able to get my first title in Indonesia," Ginting said after the match. "It was a tight game early on." The result catapults the world number 16 into the top 10 in the rankings. In the women's singles, world number one Tai Tzu Ying was too strong for India's Saina Nehwal.

The Taiwanese shuttler-who has now won the past seven encounters between the pair-dispatched Nehwal in under 30 minutes, smashing her 21-9, 21-13. Tai, who was the crowd favourite, hopes to repeat her form in this year's marquee events.

"My 2018 target is the World Championships and Asian Games because those two tournaments are the biggest," she said. China's Zheng Siwei and Huang Yaqiong defeated Indonesia's Tontowi Ahmad and Liliyana Natsir 21-14, 21-11 to claim the mixed doubles title. — AFP


Li edges McIlroy in thriller to win Dubai Desert Classic

DUBAI: China's Li Haotong edged out Rory McIlroy by a single stroke in a thrilling final round at Dubai Desert Classic yesterday to claim the second European Tour title of his career. Li put on a late burst to card 69 and finish on 23-under for the tournament with a total of 265, setting a new record to par at Emirates Golf Club in the process by overhauling the mark of 22-under set by Thomas Biorn in 2001

The 22-year-old, who claimed his first European Tour title at the 2016 China Open, started the day a stroke ahead of McIlroy, but relinquished the lead in short order with a bogey on the first hole.

"Especially the first few holes, I was quite nervous," Li said. "The first hole I made bogey and got to come back really quick, which was good." The duo then matched each other with birdies on the third and seventh, but McIlroy forged a two-stroke lead after the turn with a birdie on the par-five 10th as Li registered his second bogey of the afternoon.

The Northern Irishman was briefly pegged back after landing in the sand on the par-three 11th, but his two-shot advantage was restored

when Li made his third and final bogey on the next hole. The Chinese reacted with supreme composure in the clutch situation, going on to birdie four of his last six holes, including sinking a 25-foot putt on the 15th to draw level with McIlroy.

"The last four holes was some of the best shots in my life so far," he said. "Happy to see I can hold a trophy here. I'm looking forward to my first Masters." McIlroy, a two-time winner in Dubai, went a long way right off the 16th tee and his failure to save par gave Li the outright lead. Both men closed with a pair of birdies apiece as the Chinese held his nerve to emerge victorious. Englishman Tyrrell Hatton finished three shots behind the leader to claim third place, with Frenchman Alexander Levy a shot behind him in fourth and another Englishman, Chris Paisley, two shots further back in fifth on 17-under. — Reuters

Jay McCarthy wins Australian road race

GEELONG: Jay McCarthy became the first local rider to win the Cadel Evans Great Ocean Road Race yesterday, battling through extreme heat to finish in a sprint ahead of Italian Elia Viviani. McCarthy (Bora-Hansgrohe) took the fourth edition of the 164-kilometre (102-mile) race in Victoria in four hours and four minutes.

Viviani (Quick-Step Floors) and South Africa's Daryl Impey (Mitchelton-SCOTT), who won the UCI season-opening Tour Down Under in South Australia last week, were in second and third place respectively with the same time.

McCarthy, 25, who was second in the Australian Road Race Championship earlier this month, said he was speechless at finishing his last race in Australia with a win before heading back to Europe. He had talked up his chances of a win before the race-named after Australian cycling great Cadel Evans-as teammate and three-time world cycling champion Peter Sagan had left Australia after the Tour Down Under. Viviani said he was disappointed to have finished second but pleased with the start to his season.

"If the finish line was one metre later I would have won," the 28year-old said. "Not easy for me this course. I'm happy about my shape. Sometimes during the season I never finish in front of race like that one. So in January my shape is good."

The peloton caught the leaders with 15 kilometres to go, and a breakout of nine riders went clear in the final city circuit including Gerrans (BMC Racing Team), Esteban Chaves (Mitchelton-SCOTT), Impey and McCarthy. McCarthy eventually proved too strong in the sprint to the finish. Danish rider Lasse Norman Hansen (Aqua Blue Sport) claimed the King of the Mountain jersey, while 20year-old Belgian Bjorg Lambrecht (Lotto Soudal) won the inaugural Gerry Ryan Award for best young rider. The riders endured searing heat conditions that saw the mercury soar above 40 degree Celsius (104 degrees Fahrenheit).

Race commentators said road surface temperatures rose to 50 degrees Celsius. McCarthy, from Queensland, said he was used to the heat and humidity but still found the conditions challenging.


"I'm used to it. Still hurts ... It's more humid than normal down here. We get humidity and heat in Queensland and the two together worked well for me," he said. Australian rider Chloe Hosking (ALE) won the women's race on Saturday with a time of three hours, 15 minutes and 54 seconds.

Anthony cracks 25,000 points as Thunder beat Pistons

SAN FRANCISCO: Stephen Curry poured in 31 of his season-high 49 points in the second half Saturday night, including consecutive hoops to break a late tie, rallying the Golden State Warriors to a 109-105 victory over the Boston Celtics in a nationally televised showdown of conference leaders in Oakland, Calif. Curry's 49 points came on 16-of-24 shooting and 8-of-13 accuracy from 3-point range. Kevin Durant finished with 20 points and Draymond Green recorded a 15-point, 11rebound double-double for the Warriors, who completed a three-game home sweep of the New York Knicks, the Minnesota Timberwolves and the Celtics. Boston's Kyrie Irving had 37 points on 5-for-6 shooting from 3-point range and 13-for-18 accuracy overall. Jaylen Brown totaled 20 points and Al Horford, returning from a concussion, notched

a 15-point, 13rebound double-double for the Celtics.

THUNDER 121, PISTONS 108

Carmelo Anthony scored his 25,000th career point, Russell Westbrook notched a tripledouble, and

Oklahoma City posted its seventh straight victory by topping host Detroit. Anthony finished with 21 points and became the 21st player in NBA history to hit that mark, as well as the 25th in NBA and ABA combined history. Marcel Hirscher claims 55th World Cup win

GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN: Overall leader Marcel Hirscher earned the 55th World Cup win of his career yesterday with a commanding performance in the men's giant slalom at Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Having led after the morning's first run down the Kandahar course, the Austrian clocked a combined winning time of 2 mins 40.18sec. Hirscher finished a massive 1.57 seconds ahead of second-placed Manuel Feller, also from Austria, and 1.69 clear of the event's Olympic champion Ted Ligety of the United

This 55th win of his World Cup career pulls Hirscher above Austrian great Hermann Maier (54) into second place on the men's alltime list, behind only Ingemar Stenmark's tally of 86 victories. Hirscher, 28, has now appeared on the podium 120 times after 218 starts in World Cup races.

He is running out of time to catch Stenmark's tally as the Austrian plans to retire after next year's world championships in Are, Sweden. "In the end, everyone is beatable,

but right now I'm skiing very well," beamed Hirscher, who is on course for a seventh straight overall World Cup title.

"I'm super happy and surprised things are going so well after the stupid ankle breaks," ne added after fracturing his left ankle last August, at the start of this season's snow training. "But things are working very well and I'm in the middle of things." It was an impressive second run down the soft Garmisch course by the Austrian, who picked up time at each of the four time checks to deny Feller the first win of his career.

However, it was the first time the 25-yearold finished on the podium. Victory in the Bavarian Alps enhances Hirscher's lead at the top of the overall World Cup rankings. He is 224 points ahead of nearest rival Henrik Kristoffersen of Norway, who finished fourth in Garmisch. — AFP

Sky's the limit for Japan's pint-sized Olympic skateboarding hope

MIYAZAKI: Sky Brown is not your typical nine-year-old. Born to be wild, the freckly Japanese schoolgirl is already the world's youngest pro skateboarder, videos of her shredding have gone viral and, for super-duper kicks, she's just started jumping off the tops of buses. Sky has been skating since before she could walk and these days travels the world to compete, regularly beating the grown-upsfuelled, she says, by mum's pancakes.

Now she has set her sights on Tokyo 2020, when the hipster sport makes its Olympic bow, along with surfing, karate and sports climbing. "I've thought about the Tokyo Olympics a lot," Sky tells AFP in an interview near her family home in Miyazaki, southwestern Japan. "I'll be maybe like 12 or something," she adds, perched on a ramp built by her parents in a local park and flanked by sixyear-old brother Ocean. "I think it will be awesome. It's mostly about having fun-it will be so cool if I win though! But for me I'd like to go in there and just have fun, just be me."

Born to a Japanese mother and a British father, Sky has no doubts about which country she wants to represent. "I'd like to skate for Japan at the Tokyo Olympics because I was born here, all my friends are here and my school's here," she explains, as her trusty sidekick Ocean fidgets next to her.

Later the little girl rips into a string of jumps at breakneck speed, her long sun-bleached hair billowing in her wake. "I don't really get scared," insists the teeny boarder, who stands just 1.23 metres (four feet). "The more you get scared, the more exciting it is. I love skating because it makes me

STEELY DETERMINATION

The intrepid Brown kids are inseparable: they skate together, go surfing together, even sleep in the same bed. "Besties," as Sky calls them, the siblings also have an Instagram account which has more than 92,000 followers. Despite her tender years, there is a steely determination to Sky, who is also a professional surfer.

The little record-breaker landed her first major sponsorship deal aged seven and has already perfected several fiendishly difficult tricks that no other women have pulled off. Her father, Stu, admits he initially tried to steer his daredevil daughter away from the sport.

"Before she was three I didn't want her to get on a skateboard," he said. "You have a little girl and you want to wrap her in cotton wool. But it was the one toy she kept going back to." Her mother, Mieko, confesses to occasional nerves while watching Sky flirt with danger.

"I was sweating a bit when she first jumped off that bus," she says, as her daughter performs the same stunt, plummeting to earth and nailing a textbook landing. "But I trust her. If she says she can do it, I believe her." Arguably though it is Ocean, sporting a black beanie and shoulder-length hair, who is the real adrenaline junkie. "Ocean is more gnarly, he's uncoachable. Sky is more finesse, more elegant," explains Stu.

OLYMPIC GOLD

For now Ocean is happy to be his sister's biggest fan, tipping her to win Olympic gold in 2020. Sky, who is hoping to make her debut at extreme sports championship X Games this year, has faced resistance from various event organisers reluctant to allow her to compete-and potentially embarrass-established skaters. "They can't keep her out forever," shrugs Stu as his kids enjoy a sunset surf, noting that skateboarding's governing body have decided not to set an Olympic age limit. — AFP


England won by 12 runs, take series 4-1

Unadkat joins Stokes team in \$1.8mn IPL deal

BANGALORE: Rising pace bowler Jaydev Unadkat joined Ben Stokes in the Rajasthan Royals for \$1.8 million yesterday but a host of foreign stars went unsold in the Indian Premier League auction. The Royals made Unadkat the second most expensive player in the auction behind England's Stokes who they bought for \$1.96 million on the opening day. Stokesstill facing an assault criminal case in England-and Unadkat will join Australian captain Steve Smith at the Royals as they return to the lucrative T20 league after a two-year illegal gambling ban. The Royals were inaugural IPL champions in 2008 but were barred for two seasons with Chennai Super Kings in 2015 over an illegal gambling scandal. The team also spent almost \$1 million for uncapped Indian off-spinner Krishnappa Gowtham but were on top of the world after getting Stokes.

Royals executive chairman Ranjit Borthakur shrugged off any doubts about Stokes' legal troubles preventing him from playing in India. "We are prepared for legal consequences too. He will be a very important part of the team. We are like a start-up company. We are restarting," Borthakur said.

There was disappointment though for England Test skipper Joe Root, South Africa's Hashim Amla amd Sri Lanka paceman Lasith Malinga who all failed to find bidders on the second day. Root, Amla and Malinga did not attract bids in Saturday's

first round and were not even called back for the second day.

South Africa quick Dale Steyn, Australia batsman Shaun Marsh and New Zealand's Corey Anderson and Martin Guptill were called back but did not attract an offer. West Indies batsman Chris Gayle only found a place in the third round of bidding when Kings XI Punjab claimed him at the reserve price of \$314,000. Gayle is one of the T20 league's most prolific scorers but disappointed last year with just 200 runs in nine games for Royal Challengers Bangalore.

The second day belonged to Indian and lesser-known talent with the 26-year-old Unadkat, who has played one Test and seven one-day internationals, drawing bigger bids than big home names. Indian batsmen Manish Pandey and Lokesh Rahul both pocketed \$1.7 million after being sold to Sunrisers Hyderabad and Kings XI Punjab respectively on Saturday.

Mumbai Indians yesterday took West Indies' left-handed opener Evin Lewis for \$600,000. Among other foreign players to draw bids was Australia all-rounder Dan Christian, who was sold to Delhi Daredevils for \$238,000 and England's Sam Billings went to Chennai for \$158,000.

Teenage leg-spinner Sandeep Lamichhane became the first Nepalese to land an IPL deal. Delhi Daredevils paid \$318,000 for him. Lamichhane, 17, took 14 wickets in the under-19 World Cup last year when Nepal came eighth.

"We will have some new fans for IPL. It will be good for the kid, I hope this will start a cricket revolution in Nepal," said Delhi Daredevils chief executive Hemant Dua said. Some 581 players were up for auction ahead of the season which runs from April 7 to May 27. The IPL has been boosted by a new five year \$2.5-billion media deal. — AFP

Pakistan on top of the world with NZ T20 series win

MOUNT MAUNGANUI: Pakistan laid claim to being the best Twenty20 side in the world vesterday after beating New Zealand in the seriesdeciding third Twenty20 match in Mount Maunganui. The 18-run victory gave Pakistan a come-from-behind 2-1 series win that will see them overtake New Zealand at the top of the world rankings. Captain Sarfraz Ahmed leapt with delight after the final ball as Pakistan pulled off back-to-back wins over the hosts. Batting first on a friendly wicket, Pakistan reached 181 for six with Fakhar Zaman making 46 off 36 at the top of the innings. Umar Amin led a late charge that saw 58 runs scored in the final four overs. New Zealand, in reply, were never up with the run chase, and managed 163 for six in their 20 overs.

The defeat followed a 48-run loss in the second game, after New Zealand swept the one-day series and won the first T20. The consecutive defeats, following an unbeaten 13-match winning streak across all formats against the West Indies and Pakistan, put a dampener on New Zealand's preparation for next month's triangular series with Australia and England.

Zaman was the architect at the start of the Pakistan innings with a sharp 46 before being dismissed in a debatable decision when Tom Bruce took a catch at ground level.

Television replays were inconclusive on whether the ball touched the grass, and after lengthy deliberations the third umpire ruled in favour of the on-field decision. Haris Sohail chipped in with 20 off 12 balls while Aamer Yamin, replacing the injured Hasan Ali, faced six deliveries for his 15. New Zealand struggled from the start of their reply to get near the required run rate of more than nine an over, and were in early trouble when Faheem Ashraf claimed Kane Williamson for nine. Martin Guptill attempted to bully the bowlers but it was primarily a lone stand. When he was removed for 59 off 43 balls in the 13th over, the required run rate had shot up to 13.57. Ross Taylor put the ball over the boundary fence three times in his 25 off 10 balls. But with his dismissal in the 17th over, New Zealand were 128 for five and their hopes of a miraculous comeback were over. — AFP

LONDON: Michy Batshuayi scored twice as Chelsea to be here. It's not for me to decide, it's the boss... it's beat Premier League rivals Newcastle 3-0 to advance into the fifth round of the FA Cup at Stamford Bridge yesterday. Batshuayi's goals in the 31st and 44th minutes and a Marcos Alonso free-kick 18 minutes from time were enough for Premier League champions Chelsea to see off Rafael Benitez's struggling side.

The Belgian's striker's first was the result of a neat team move, Pedro's superb through ball splitting the

Newcastle defence and leading to Eden Hazard slipping a pass inside to Alonso. Spaniard Alonso toed the ball first-time to Batshuavi, who made no mistake with a simple finish from eight yards out. The Belgian forward scored his and Chelsea's second goal shortly before halftime when Pedro again initiated an attacking move, his pass releasing Hazard to run at a struggling defence.

Batshuayi, up in support, looked set to run across his man but instead moved away, creating the space for Hazard to play him in before his shot took a huge deflection off Newcastle's Jamaal Lascelles and looped over goalkeeper Karl Darlow.

Any lingering doubt about the result was settled in the 72nd minute when Alonso whipped a left-footed free-kick over the defensive wall to make it 3-0.

'TAKE THE CHANCE'

There have been suggestions that Batshuayi could be on his way out of Stamford Bridge during the closing days of the January transfer window. But as for his immediate future, Batshuayi said he wanted to impress Blues manager Antonio Conte, telling BT Sport: "When I have a chance I take the chance and I work every day best that you ask Conte!"

The Chelsea boss said he had no desire to see Batshuayi depart the club. "Scoring goals is important for strikers' confidence. My task is to keep every single player happy and with Michy I think we are doing a good job," Conte said. Chelsea are 15 points behind runaway league leaders Manchester City and, following their League Cup semi-final loss to Arsenal, the FA Cup

> offers Conte's men their best chance of a domestic trophy this season. "There were some great performances, especially from this man next to me (Batshuayi) with two great goals," said Chelsea captain Gary Cahill. "It (the FA Cup) a very important competition for us this year," the defender added.

By contrast, Premier League survival is the priority for a Newcastle side that

Federer wins sixth Australian Open

'The fairytale continues for us, for me, it's incredible'

MELBOURNE: Roger Federer survived a second set 'freeze' and an onslaught from Croatia's Marin Cilic to claim a record-equalling sixth Australian Open title on Rod Laver Arena yesterday. The Swiss maestro wobbled at times in the face of some fierce resistance before winning 6-2 6-7(5) 6-3 3-6 6-1.

With the stadium roof closed to keep out the withering Melbourne heat, the 36-year-old grabbed the first set in 24 minutes as a 20th grand slam title looked a formality. But Cilic, who suffered a nightmare in last year's Wimbledon final against Federer when blisters wrecked his chances, was not going to let his first Australian Open

At times it seemed he was taking on Federer and crowd but when he reeled off five consecutive games to extend the champion into a deciding set, the match hung in the balance. Federer recovered his mojo after saving two break points at the start of the fifth and was roared home to victory. Despite all his titles and accolades, Federer was overcome with emotion during his victory speech.

"The fairytale continues for us, for me, it's incredible," Federer, who equalled Novak Djokovic and Roy Emerson's Australian Open haul, said on court as wife Mirka and Australian great Rod Laver recorded to the moment with their mobile phones.

grand slam drought that had many people writing him off, Federer has enjoyed a glorious renaissance over the past 12 months by winning three of the past five majors.

"Getting number six here and number 20 overall, it's just a very special moment," he said. Cilic, who will rise to a career-high three in the rankings, won four points in the first four games, but despite a shamelessly pro-Federer crowd, he

stuck to his guns.

Order was quickly restored as Federer broke once to take the third set and when he had a point for a double break in the fourth, the title beckoned. Cilic blasted his way out of trouble though and when he broke to love for 3-3, he looked menacing. Cilic will rue the two break points that got away in the first game of the decider, failing to make a return on both.—Reuters

LONDON: Kevin De Bruyne starred as Manchester City stayed on course for an unprecedented quadruple of major trophies in the one season with a 2-0 win at Cardiff yesterday that saw the runaway Premier League leaders into the last 16 of the FA Cup.

City, 12 points clear at the summit of English football, are bidding to bring the Premier League, FA Cup, League Cup and Champions League titles to the Etihad.

They made short work of second-tier Cardiff, with Belgian star De Bruyne putting them ahead just eight minutes when he

deceived the home side with a brilliant free-kick that he struck under, rather than over, the defensive wall.

Bernardo Silva appeared to have doubled the visitors' lead with a thunderous 26th-minute shot but his goal was ruled out because the officials deemed Leroy Sane to be off-side and interfering with play. It appeared a harsh call but, with the controversial video assistant referee system that is being trialled in some English cup ties this season not in use for this match, there was no way of reviewing the

But the second goal that Pep Guardiola's men had threatened arrived in the 37th minute when Silva's superb curling cross from the left was glanced in by Raheem Sterling.

Sane was the victim of a bad tackle by Joe Bennett in first-half stoppage time and was replaced at the break by Sergio Aguero. Cardiff defender Bennett was sent off in injury time at the end of the match when he received a second yellow card for another poor challenge, on Brahim Diaz.

Meanwhile, Premier League survival is the priority for a Newcastle side that are currently just one point above the relegation zone. Newcastle manager Benitez, asked if he would be able to bring in a new striker before the transfer window shuts on Wednesday, replied: "I don't think so but we will see. We will try to do something."

Benitez's former club Liverpool have also missed out on the last 16 after a 3-2 defeat by top-flight strugglers West Brom at Anfield on Saturday where Jay Rodriguez's two goals for the Baggies were overshadowed by several controversial incidents involving VAR rulings.

Tottenham Hotspur remain in the fifthround draw, but only after an equaliser from Harry Kane eight minutes from time saw them to a 1-1 draw away to fourth-tier Newport on Saturday.—AFP



KIB records net profit of KD 17.7m

5% growth in financing income, 7% growth in depositors' accounts in 2017

KUWAIT: Sheikh Mohammed Jarrah Al-Sabah, Chairman of Kuwait International Bank (KIB) announced that the Bank reported a net profit of KD 17.7million for the year ended 31 December 2017. Al-Jarra hstated that the Bank's improved performance reflected positively on reported core operating income, which increased to KD 64.3 million compared to KD 63.2 million in 2016. Total financing income increased by 5%, or by KD 3.6 million, reaching KD 74.6million compared to KD71 million during 2016. Revenue from fees and commissions increased by 6%, to reach KD 9.3million, as compared to KD 8.8 million in 2016. Investment income significantly increased by 68% to reach KD 4.5 million compared to KD 2.7 million in 2016.



As for dividends, Al-Jarrah stated that KIB's Board of Directors proposed payment of cash dividends of 10% of the share nominal value (10 fils per share) for 2017, subject to the approval of the Bank's AGM and regulatory authorities. KIB's total assets increased by 4% reaching KD 1.9 billion compared to KD 1.8 billion of 2016. This increase is attributable to a growth in the financing portfolio by KD 36million reaching KD 1.3 billion compared to KD 1.27 billion last year achieving 3% growth compared to the previous year. Additionally, the investment portfolio increased by KD 18 million, ie by 14% reaching KD 145.7 million compared to KD 127.8 million in 2016.

Depositors' accounts rose to KD 1.2 billion compared to KD 1.1 billion by the end of the previous year, an increase of KD 78 million representing a growth of 7%. KIB continued to maintain its excellent performance as the ratio for total provision and collateral coverage was at 193% for the year 2017, where capital adequacy ratio (CAR) reached to 19.05%

(CAR) reached to 19.05% within the framework of CBK regulations on Basel III, while the financial leverage ratio was 10.92% for the year 2017.

Distributions to depositors' accounts registered a consistent growth during 2017 whereby the annualized return on Arzaaq Deposit in Kuwaiti Dinars progressively increased to 2.65%, 2.68%, 2.7% and 2.72% during Q1, Q2, Q3 and Q4 2017 respectively. Average annualized rate for 2017 stood at 2.687%. Meanwhile, Al Boushra three-year deposits in Kuwait Dinar were offered annualized return 3.3% in Q4 2017 with an average rate for 2nd half 2017 of 3.275%. Profits were credited to depositors' accounts upon declaring the financial results.

IMF invites Arab nations to tackle public 'frustration'

'Low growth, high unemployment and corruption'

RABAT: The International Monetary Fund is holding a two-day regional conference from today in Morocco with a message of reform amid growing "frustration" among the population of some Arab states. "Rising social tensions and protests in several countries across the Middle East and North Africa are a clear indication that the aspirations of the people of the region, for opportunity, prosperity and equity, remain unfulfilled," said Jihad Azour, director of the IMF's Middle East and Central Asia department. "Reforms are the key to address the fundamental problems that have plagued so many countries of the region for so long: low growth, high unemployment and corruption," he wrote in an analysis ahead of the conference in Marrakesh.

Unemployment in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region ranks among the highest in the world, with a jobless figure of more than 50 percent, largely due to the low participation of women in the workforce in conservative Arab countries. In Marrakesh, government officials, business leaders and civil society figures will hear the IMF's priorities: to fight corruption, create jobs for the young, bring more women into economic life and boost the private sector.

The IMF said: "Frustration runs high over the lack of job opportunities and access to affordable, high-quality public services." "With over 60 percent of its population under the age of 30, the region desperately needs higher growth and more jobs," it said, adding that around 5.5 million young people will join the job market each year over the next five years.

Balancing act

In a region at the centre of the 2011 Arab Spring uprisings, born largely out of economic hardship and discontent among the young, reforms have proved a delicate balancing act. To benefit from IMF loans, countries such as Tunisia, Egypt and Jordan have had to reduce their budget deficits, resulting in cost of living rises for their citizens. An austerity budget in Tunisia, along with increases in VAT, sent demonstrators out onto the streets in early January.

"The frustration the Tunisian people are feeling is understandable," said IMF spokesman Gerry Rice, speaking on the seventh anniversary of the Tunisian uprising that launched the Arab Spring. However, he defended the institution against the "outdated" view that it is the IMF itself that causes the suffering. "Speaking for the IMF, we do not want austerity. We do want well-designed, well-implemented, socially balanced reforms," he said. Egypt, whose economy was also hit hard in the turbulence of its own uprising, in 2016 launched a reform program in exchange for a \$12 billion IMF loan. It has since floated its currency against the dollar, triggering sharp price rises. Jordan on Saturday increased the price of bread by up to 100 percent after lifting subsidies on the staple in a bid to redress its debt-riddled economy. Past price hikes have sparked riots in the cash-strapped country, which has a public debt of some \$35 billion, equivalent to 90 percent of its gross domestic product. In 2016, Jordan secured a \$723-million three-year credit line from the IMF to support economic and financial reforms. —AFP

KD 184m net profit for KFH shareholders in 2017

Shareholders' equity increased to reach KD 1.872 billion i.e. an increase of KD 61.8 million or 3.4% compared to last year. KFH's capital adequacy ratio (CAR) reached 17.76%, (after the recommended distributions) i.e. higher than the required limit of 15%, thus reiterating the strength of KFH financial position.

Hawkish-tilting Fed could move rates quicker

WASHINGTON: The Federal Reserve likely will leave the benchmark US interest rate untouched next week, but economists say the changing composition of the policy committee could point to faster rate hikes in 2018. Markets are betting the first of the three interest rate moves expected this year will come at the Fed's next meeting in March.

That will allow the Fed's interest-rate setting body, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC), to wait for firmer signs of inflation, which has long run below the Fed's two percent target. But changing economic conditions-the massive tax cuts approved last month, recovering energy prices, a weaker US dollar, new trade tariffs and stronger global growth-could combine with a widespread US labor shortage to

spur wage gains and cause a demand-driven rise in inflation, analysts say.

At the same time the changing makeup of the FOMC appears to be leaning in a more hawkish, inflation-averse direction, which raises the chances the committee will raise rates four times rather than three. "It looks like in 2018 it will be justified to be more hawkish," Diane Swonk, chief economist at Grant Thornton, told AFP. "You'll get doves becoming more hawkish much more rapidly when conditions are changing." The 12 presidents of the regional Federal Reserve banks rotate as voting members of the FOMC each year, along with members of the Fed Board of Governors who always vote.

Chicago Fed President Charles Evans and Minneapolis President Neel Kashkari, who both opposed last month's rate hike, will not vote this year. But Cleveland's Loretta Mester, who twice dissented in favor of higher rates in 2016, will become a voter. Mester will be joined by San Francisco's John Williams, a centrist and ally of outgoing Chair Janet Yellen, and the Atlanta region's newly-appointed Raphael Bostic, who is an unknown but pegged as a dove by analysts at IHS Markit. Thomas Barkin, who took over this month as president of the traditionally hawkish Richmond Fed also will be voting for the first time.

A more challenging environment

This week's meeting will be Yellen's last, and once she steps down at the start of February, President Donald Trump is in a position to stack the Fed's Board, with the chance name all but



one of its seven members. Jerome Powell, who will take over as Fed chair, has served on the board with Yellen since 2012 and is unlikely to depart too easily from the path she charted, having supported her post-crisis policy of painstakingly cautious rate increases.

But observers say the jury is still out on conservative Trump nominee Marvin Goodfriend, a university professor and former Richmond Fed adviser. Goodfriend struggled in Senate testimony this month to explain why his predictions of "disastrous" post-crisis inflation had been wrong. He has frequently called for higher rates and scolded the Fed last year for failing to guard against the risk of rising prices-but also favors allowing even negative rates when needed to stimulate growth. University of Oregon economist Tim Duy, a keen Fed observer, told AFP the Fed would do well to avoid overreacting by raising rates more than three times. "They will need to be wary of the long and variable lags in the policy process; they will need to take some time to see the impact of their past tightening," he said. "So I tend to think you need further evidence of excessive inflationary risks before they ratchet up the pace of rate increases." With Wall Street forging ever higher, Swonk of Grant Thornton said the Fed may also feel compelled to respond to prevent a bubble in asset prices, even though monetary policy tools are ill-suited to address those issues. "So far, Chair Yellen gets to leave without leaving a ripple on financial markets," Swonk said. "That's great to leave on that note and the ripples may be yet to come." —AFP

China tightens screws on social platform media

Regulators demand week-long shutdown of Weibo

BEIJING: Chinese authorities have ordered a major social media platform to curb "harmful content" more effectively as they intensify oversight of online expression-even taking aim at rap music, crude cartoons, dirty jokes and celebrity gossip. The campaign is intended not just to stamp out dissent but to ensure that all media "serves the direction of socialism".

Sina Weibo has failed to comply, Beijing's Cyberspace Administration said Saturday on its official WeChat social media account, berating the site for letting users post "content of wrong public opinion orientation, obscenity, low taste and ethnic dis-crimination". The company "has violated the country's laws and regulations, led online public opinions to wrong direction and left a



since President Xi Jinping assumed power in 2012. A controversial cybersecurity law, which took effect last June, has given authorities even more leeway to regulate a wide variety of information. At the time, the cyberspace administrator told major internet companies to obey


the provisions of the new law requiring online news and information services to "serve the direction of socialism and correctly guide public opinion". Since then they have taken aim at not just explicit depictions of sex and violence, but anything the authorities consider low brow: from crude cartoons and dirty jokes to celebrity gossip

Earlier in January, social media began circulating a gov-

ernment order apparently issued to Chinese broadcasters banning them from giving air time to "artists with tattoos, hip hop music" and other performers who are "in conflict with the party's core values and morals". In punishment for Weibo's failure to toe the lengthening party line, regulators have demanded a weeklong shutdown of the site's offending features, including

one that allows users to pay to ask celebrities questions, as well as a function to search trending topics.

It was far from the first time the authorities have expressed concern over content on the social media giant, which is owned by internet behemoth Sina. The company has tried to counter criticism by banning keywords and hiring thousands of censors to laboriously take down posts that violate the party's ever stricter dictums. On Weibo, China's Twitter-like platform, commenters were quick to take issue with the government's decision. "This is just an excuse to better control the trending topics search," said one user. "From now on, the things you see on the page will be what (the government) wants to make you see."—AFP

Macron 'completely changed' France's image, says tech billionaire

PARIS: President Emmanuel Macron has "completely changed" France's image, telecoms billionaire Xavier Niel said Wednesday, crediting the youthful, pro-business politician with attracting an influx of tech talent. "He has given France a pro-startup, pro-entrepreneur image abroad that we did not really have before," said Niel, who bankrolled a giant startup incubator on the banks of the Seine river in Paris that opened a month after Macron's election last year.

Speaking to a group of foreign correspondents at Station F — the world's biggest incubator which is nourishing 1,000 startups-Niel praised Macron's reform of the labor code and of wealth and investment taxes. But his most important achievement to date has been to change France's image as being a place that is unfriendly to business, said 50-year-old Niel, a serial entrepreneur nicknamed the "French Steve Jobs".

"France has not changed... What really changed is the fact of having a young, dynamic president, who is not from any political party," he said. On Wednesday, Macron took his pledge of a French renaissance to the world's business elite gathered in the Swiss resort of Davos. "France is back at the core of Europe," said the 40-year-old former investment banker, who has been hailed as a potential savior of a liberal post-war order under threat from Donald Trump's America and Britain's decision to leave the EU.

Trump, Brexit boost

Niel, vice-president of Iliad which owns France's second-biggest mobile phone operator, said Trump's nativist policies and climate change denialism had contributed to France's growing appeal as a place to start a business. "England maybe does not appear very stable under Theresa May, Germany doesn't maybe seem much fun with a leader who is starting to get on in years and the United States under Donald Trump doesn't seem very welcoming to strangers," he said. "In the midst of all that, we're doing quite nicely.'

Station F manager Roxanne Varza said the incubator, which Niel paid for with 250 million euros of his own money, received more applications from US and UK start-ups last year than any other country. Niel singled out Macron's introduction of a flat tax rate of 30 percent on capital gains and dividends as one of the most significant reforms for companies looking to invest in new technology companies.

But much of what is drawing tech firms to Paris predates Macron. It was Macron's predecessor Francois Hollande who set up new visas for digital entrepreneurs. In its 2017 State of European Tech report the investment firm Atomico noted that Britain remained the biggest recipient of venture capital funding at \$5.4 billion — more than double that of France. But it was France that closed the most deals.—AFP

Estonia makes 'token' effort to take euro crypto

TALLINN: Estonia is looking to drag the euro into the crypto age-and tame the volatility plaguing bitcoin and its peers-by creating a digital token backed by the single European currency. Cryptocurrencies have been on a rollercoaster ride recently, with bitcoin swinging from \$10,000 to nearly \$20,000 and back in under two months, and volatility is a major hurdle to their widespread adoption for electronic transactions.

One way to counter this would be to issue digital versions of an existing currency, but an initial proposal by a government agency in eurozone member Estonia was torpedoed by European Central Bank chief Mario Draghi last year. Nevertheless, Kaspar Korjus, managing director of the Estonian government's e-Residency global digital identity program, is back with three new proposals to create an "estcoin" digital token that "doesn't necessarily" break ECB rules.

His three models for creating an "estcoin" would use the blockchain technology behind bitcoin and other peerto-peer payment systems. Blockchain experts argue that one of the proposals could pave the way for the European single currency to be used on a blockchain platform, but forex analysts are skeptical.

e-Residency

Estonia, the birthplace of Skype and digital global money transfer site Transferwise, is something of a pioneer in shifting government services online. And it also seeking to make it easier for businesses to operate. Korjus' e-Residency program allows people worldwide to open businesses in Estonia-and hence the European Union-and manage them remotely, declaring taxes and signing documents digitally. More than 4,000 businesses and 28,000 individuals have signed up to the scheme since it was launched in 2014.

All three "estcoin" proposals would be tied exclusively to the e-Residency program. In the first, Estonian e-residency holders investing in the program would be rewarded with estcoins. In the second, "estcoins" would be tied to a user's e-Residency identity and used for "digitally signing documents, logging into services or enforcing smart contracts." In both of these versions, the estcoin's value would depend on its usefulness on the blockchain, and would not be pegged to the euro.

'No alternative to euro'

A third model would essentially enable anyone in Estonia's e-residency community to use euros on the blockchain, Korjus said. Under this version, "banks would

be required to move money in and out of euro estcoins, but transactions could then take place independently of them through the blockchain," Korjus explained in an official blog post. Here, the estcoin's value would be backed up by "the commitment of the government to buy back every euro estcoin for one euro", which would be the first time a cryptocurrency was backed up by a state guarantee to convert it into a major currency.

According to cryptocurrency expert Xen Baynham-Herd, this third proposal would be a "new way of expressing a currency, but not a new currency itself." He likens it to the "utility settlement coin", a prototype he helped develop at Swiss bank UBS and which is intended to be used for settling trades of financial instruments. UBS and other banks have teamed up to use blockchain technology to speed up such settlements and they suggest resolving the issue of the unit's value by linking it to an existing currency. Baynham-Herd said the prototype unit would be backed by "existing cash reserves held at a central bank or commercial bank which is exactly what the 'euro estcoin'

'Interesting experiment'

Since such a prototype was being explored by a large number of central and commercial banks around the world,

"the underlying idea isn't hugely controversial," said Baynham-Herd, who is now head of strategy and lead economist at Blockchain.com, which develops blockchain infrastructure. He believes ECB chief Draghi would view the new "euro estcoin" token differently, since it was "simply a new way of issuing or representing existing

euro reserves. The value would be one-to-one-there's no new money being created."

But Fawad Razaqzada, an analyst at Forex.com, was more cautious, saving if the "euro estcoin" were pegged to the single currency, it would "effectively create new euros", which would be illegal. He pointed out that the Estonian government's involvement would lend the token a legitimacy and value that many cryptocurrencies were lacking at the moment. "Whatever the outcome, it will be an interesting experiment," he said via email.

Estonia's central bank has been cool to the proposals, which it notes have yet to be officially endorsed by the government. "The emission of virtual tokens that could be converted limitlessly into euros according to an officially fixed exchange rate would definitely be more problematic than the authors imagine, spokeswoman Ingrid Mitt said. But Siim Sikkut, a senior official at Estonia's finance ministry, said that "we fully welcome the e-Residency team's

Take the next U-turn: US driver following GPS plunges into lake

WASHINGTON: Technology won't always save us. A man blindly following his GPS app has driven an SUV with two passengers on board into an icy lake in the northeastern state of Vermont, local police said. The trio-friends from out of state driving a borrowed car-escaped unharmed, local media and police in the city of Burlington said in their report of the January 12 incident. The unnamed driver of the Jeep Compass "followed the GPS directions, which advised to go straight, and upon following this he went down the boat ramp onto the ice," the report read.

The vehicle initially slid, but the ice on the surface of Lake Champlain quickly cracked and the Jeep sank. The officer who wrote the report said he believed the driver "was not under the influence of alcohol or drugs at the time of the incident." "The only visible portion of the vehicle was its rear bumper," as the rest of the car was submerged, the report said. It added that the time of the accident "there was a heavy rain and slight fog in the area."

"I was speechless," vehicle owner Tara Guertin later told WCAX-3 local CBS affiliate television. "My first thing was, 'Is everybody OK?' Because this could have had a very bad ending, and luckily everybody was alright." The Jeep was finally pulled from the water on Monday.Guertin told local reporters that the driver was using the Waze app, which uses user-supplied data to help people find alternate routes to avoid traffic jams or speed cameras.

Google, the internet giant that owns Waze, could not explain how the app directed the driver into the lake. "Waze maps are updated with millions of edits to adapt to real time road conditions daily, often making them the most accurate available," Google spokesperson Julie Mossler said. Mossler sagely advised drivers "to keep their eyes on the road and use all environmental information available to them to make the best decisions as they drive."—AFP

Dutch police launch biggest **DNA** hunt for boy's killer

THE HAGUE: Dutch police on Friday launched the country's biggest ever DNA search, asking over 20,000 men to come forward as they seek to resolve the 1998 murder of a young boy. "Some 21,500 men will receive a personal invitation in February to voluntarily give DNA samples," police said in a statement. "It's the largest such DNA investigation in search of family ties ever carried out in The Netherlands.'

Eleven-year-old Nicky Verstappen disappeared during the night of August 9, 1998, while on a summer camp at the Brunssumerheide nature reserve, near the German border. His body was found the next evening, close to the camp site. "This large-scale DNA research comes as a final attempt to answer the question who left traces" on Nicky's clothes, the

police said. They stressed the men, aged between 18 to 75, were not suspects in the murder, but could help "make a major contribution to finally shine a light on what happened to Nicky in August 1998".

The police were searching to see "if the DNA donor has any family ties to the person who left traces in the place where Nicky was found." The men are all from Heibloem, where Nicky lived, and villages surrounding the nature reserve, the public broadcaster NOS said. Analysis of the DNA samples is likely to take between six to 12 months, and if any matches are found then further research will have to be carried out. Several collection points will be set up and remain open for

Since October police have been also carrying out a voluntary DNA drive among some 1,500 men who were regular visitors to the camp. But so far it has not turned up any clues. Dutch police however may have cracked another cold case in December, when the collection of 130 DNA samples led to the arrest of a suspect in the 1992 murder and rape of a young woman in Zaandam, close to Amsterdam.—AFP

100 years after the 'Spanish flu', new global pandemics feared

Are we ready for the next pandemic?

DAVOS: Ebola, zika, SARS: a century after the "Spanish flu" killed 50 million people, humanity now risks a new wave of deadly diseases, and in today's globalised world another such pandemic may be unavoidable, experts warned at the Davos summit this week. "Pandemics are becoming a real threat to humanity," Elhadi As Sy, secretary general of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies said at the World Economic Forum in the Swiss resort.

One Davos discussion titled "Are We Ready For the Next Pandemic?" was joined by experts including Sylvie Briand, a specialist in infectious diseases at the World Health Organization around the world after international travelers

(WHO). "We know that it is coming, but we have no way of stopping it," she said. This year marks the centenary of the worst epidemic in history: the so-called Spanish flu-an outbreak that experts say was actually imported to Europe by troops from the United States coming to fight in World War One.



Across the world, the disease killed more people in two years than the four years of fighting had.

Richard Hatchett, director of the public-private Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI), said India lost five percent of its population in 1918 - the only time in the country's history that its population declined. A century on, a new flu virus is the risk that most worries experts. "The flu is a respiratory virus that is easily transmitted and people can be contagious even before they show symptoms, so it is not easy to control," said Briand. Its numerous forms are also able to "marry" one another or bond with viruses from birds or pigs in potentially deadly new combinations.

Still vulnerable

Despite the development of anti-viral drugs, antibiotics and the first vaccines, two other flu pandemics erupted after the Spanish flu, in 1957 and 1968 - killing millions. More recent epidemics have reminded the world that it is still vulnerable to outbreaks. The SARS respiratory virus killed some 770 people in 2003. "These past three years, there has been Ebola in West Africa, zika in South America and more recently a plague epidemic in Madagascar" last year, said Sy.

Ebola haemorraghic fever killed 11,000 in West Africa in 2014 and 2015. The disease also spread

"Humanity is more vulnerable in the face of epidemics because we are much more connected and we travel around much more quickly than before," said Briand. "When we travel, the viruses travel with us.' Hatchett warned that disease specialists are still dealing with the consequences of zika,

a mosquito-borne disease which causes birth defects. The outbreak in Latin America in 2015 took scientists by surprise.

Preparing for catastrophe

Experts also warned of the economic impact of outbreaks. In 2015 hundreds of cases of the MERS respiratory syndrome cost South Korea 10 billion dollars, Hatchett said. Billionaire philanthropist and Microsoft founder Bill Gates estimated in February 2017 that preparing to respond to a global pandemic would cost \$3.4 billion a year. The potential cost of one if the world is unprepared could be \$570 billion, he said. Gates is one of the main backers of the CEPI, which has overall funding of \$700

million and was launched at last year's Davos summit. The CEPI is seeking to develop treatments for three viruses for which there is currently none: MERS (Middle East Respiratory Syndrome), Lassa fever which is endemic in West Africa, and Nipah in Malaysia and Bangladesh.


"At the WHO, we are trying to prepare for a catastrophe, hoping to reduce the impact as much as possible," said Briand. Developing a vaccine against a new virus, however, is dangerous and can take up to six months, the WHO says. It costs up to \$200 million, says Peter Piot, director of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. That is not a big motivation for pharmaceutical laboratories, Hatchett said. "There is no commercial market for these products until there is an epidemic and then everyone wants the vaccine that doesn't exist." —AFP





Art experts fume at 'fake' Russian art in Belgian museum

n exhibition at a state museum in Belgium featuring previously un-seen Russian paintings has sent ripples through the art community, with some experts claiming the works are "fake". Twenty-six works supposedly by famous avant-garde artists, including Kazimir Malevich and Wassily Kandinsky, have been on display since October at the Museum of Fine Arts in Ghent, on loan from a collector named Igor Toporovski who insists they are genuine. When photographs of the pieces appeared online they caused a storm, leaving art experts in Russia and abroad questioning whether such a prominent collection of unknown works by highly sought-after artists could have been amassed in secret.

"He showed outright fake works," Vitaly Patsyukov, who curates Moscow's State Centre of Modern Art, said of the collector. "These are clearly fakes, they are compiled from fragments (copied from real paintings)." Some of the pieces indeed bear resemblances to known works. For example, a standing nude allegedly by Vladimir Tatlin depicts a strikingly similar pose to an established painting of a seated nude. An open letter by a group of art historians last week cautioned that the paintings are not in any known catalogues, suggesting the museum removes the works until all questions about their provenance are sufficiently addressed.

On Wednesday, the museum published a statement on its website saying it had "followed the usual procedures for incoming loans and carried a thorough art historical and comparative investigation into the works". It had discussed the provenance of the works with their formal owner, Toporovski's Dielghem Foundation, but said it stopped short of laboratory analysis which is standard practice "only in the case of acquisitions". Toporovski has maintained that his collection is genuine, calling the experts' letter an "unjust attack" guided by art merchants who want to preserve their commercial interests. Yet the controversy prompted the museum to "establish a committee of experts" with the Flemish culture ministry and Ghent city hall "to restore peace in order for the museum to concentrate on its main duties," in the words of deputy mayor Annelies Storms.

'Inconceivable' collection

The scandal could have been avoided had the museum consulted notable experts in the field, according to Andrei Sarabyanov, an art historian and curator of the Avant-garde Centre at the Jewish Museum in Moscow. "To make an exhibit with questionable works is just shameful," he told AFP. "Maybe they have a hostile attitude towards experts, but it would be logical to ask, to show photographs," he said, calling the case unprecedented. "There have been exhibits with bad works in private galleries before, but never at a state museum," he said.

Collectors and historians agree that counterfeit art is a problem that has particularly affected the Russian avant-garde, a revolutionary peri-

od spanning between 1890 and 1930 which has been in fashion for several docades

Real Russian avant-garde art is rare on the market, and most works are well known, said British collector and art historian Matthew Bown, who specializes in 20th-century Russian art. He said he was offered a real Malevich only once in his 30-year career, but is regularly offered fakes. "Even if you are the richest oligarch in Russia, the richest man in the world, if you're Jeff Bezos of Amazon or Bill Gates or whoever, you would not be able to put together a collection like this," he told AFP. "It's completely inconceivable."

When fake art is exhibited in a prominent museum, it not only boosts the value of the piece but also "begins to mess up art history for art historians," he said. With an aura of authenticity around fake works, "the story of the artist begins to get distorted." Sarabyanov went as far as to suggest the incident in Ghent could have been orchestrated to manipulate the art market. "Over the last decade, prices on avantgarde art fell because of fakes, but rose again in the last two years," he said. "Perhaps this is a cunning move to drop them again." — AFP

'Beetle Bailey' comic strip creator dies aged 94

ort Walker, the artist and creator of the decades-long running comic strip "Beetle Bailey" about the antics of a work-shirking Army private, died at his home Saturday, his family said. He was 94.

His son Greg Walker, who co-wrote the strip with his father in his later years, said his dad died at his home in Stamford, Connecticut, of pneumonia while recovering from a broken hip. Mort Walker drew his daily award-winning comic strip for 68 years, longer than any other comic strip artist, his son said. "He was drawing up to the end," Greg Walker said. "He holds the record. I don't think anyone will beat him."

His strip debuted in 1950 with Beetle as a college student, but Mort Walker had Beetle enlist in the Army in the first year of the cartoon and it was a hit. Picked up by King Features Syndicate, it went from a 12-newspaper run to eventually reaching 200 million readers in 1,800 newspapers worldwide, King Features' website says. The lanky slacker Pvt. Beetle, along with his foils Sgt. Snorkle and Gen. Halftrack, inhabit the fictional Camp Swampy inspired loosely on Mort Walker's experience of Army life in World War II.

But Beetle and his friends never saw battle in the strip and he seemed to be in perpetual training. They have been featured in a television cartoon series, games, books and postage stamps. Greg Walker said his father, along with "Peanuts" and Charlie Brown creator Charles Schultz, pioneered the gag-a-day format of comic strips, breaking form the serial story lines of the day.

"Serial strips were dominant and this was something new," he said. "It's now the standard." Mort Walker was also a co-creator of the long-running strip "Hi and Lois" about a suburban American family, which continues today, written and drawn by his sons Greg and Brian Walker and also artist Chance Browne. Greg Walker said that Beetle and his friends will go on in the funny pages as a legacy to his father. "He certainly was an icon, the last cartoonist of the golden age of comic strips," he said on his Facebook page. — Reuters



Benin's Pendjari National Park comes back to life

ean-Marc Froment leant against a railing at the lodge in Pendjari National Park in Benin's far north, and spotted about 40 elephants drinking at a large water hole. Almost in slow motion, a group of adults-their trunks and ears pointing forward-chased away two female lions watching nearby and stood in the way of other predators so their young could quench their thirst in safety. "See how they're arriving calmly? That was unthinkable a couple of months ago. They were still very nervous," said Froment, the head of conservation for African Parks. Froment, who is originally from Belgium, moved to Benin four months ago and has spent his working life across Africa, helping countries to protect their national parks, which have often been destroyed by decades of conflict.

Benin isn't at war. But Pendjari, situated more than 12 hours by road from the economic capital Cotonou on the Atlantic coast, has suffered years of political and economic neglect. The 4,700-square-kilometre (1,814square-mile) park is one of three straddling the borders of northern Benin and neighboring Burkina Faso and Niger. It's one of the last sanctuaries of untamed wildlife in West Africa, whose flora and fauna have been forgotten since French colonial days. Pendjari has suffered poaching of elephants for ivory, illegal hunting and tree felling.

Jose Pliya, the director of Benin's National Agency for the Promotion of Heritage and Tourism Development (ANPT), said the park was "dying a slow death". The government set up the ANPT to speed up the implementation of new projects, with President Patrice Talon having made tourism a key priority of his fiveyear tenure. "The head of state often compares Benin's rich heritage and culture to untapped oil deposits," said Pliya. Only about 200,000 visitors came to Benin in 2014-15 but Talon has an ambitious aim to attract one million

between now and 2021 and create 100,000 jobs in the next decade. "We're working on six projects across the country and at the moment Pendjari is the furthest forward," said Pliya.

'It's all to do'

To bring a park of such a size back to life, Benin has needed to find investors willing to put in \$26 million (21 million euros) over 10 years. The government has committed itself to up to \$6 million. In Rwanda, gorilla conservation programs have made tourism a leading money-spinner, bringing in \$400 million in revenue in 2016. Benin wants to follow suit.

"The increase in wildlife will be our sign of success," said Froment, whose non-profit employer has been given the task of managing Pendjari. There are currently only estimates of the number of lions, buffalo and hippos but a census is being undertaken, using a microlight plane flying at low altitude.

"There was no way of flying in the park before. But it's a must. From the sky you can see carcasses, forest fires, poachers," said pilot Stephane Carre. The habits and movements of the wild animals also need to be understood. Collars with satellite tracking devices have been fitted onto a number of elephants and lions. That will help determine where to deploy some of the 60 or so new rangers who have been trained to protect the animals, and also where to build lodges and new airstrips for tourists. Whether the park will aim at travellers from the luxury market or a younger, backpacker clientele is unclear at the moment, said park director James Terjanian. "It's all to do, that's what's exciting about it," he said.

'Minister for Pendjari'

The biggest challenge in an impoverished, densely populated region is acceptance from people in surrounding villages, whose residents already suffer restrictions. "They can't go to farm or fish" in the park, said Djaleni

Djatto, who handles relations between the park and local communities. Development will be a non-starter if locals don't benefit economically. As well as creating direct employment in tourism, African Parks is looking at developing beekeeping to export honey and also making shea butter for the cosmetics industry.

About 1,000 children from villages around the park have visited since May last year. Among the latest were about 30 primary school pupils, who arrived in a minibus in early January, their eyes fixed on the bush. The sun had only been up for about two hours and the hot, dry air was falling on a large pool where a heron was hunting fish from the back of a hippopotamus. The children, in worn clothing and mismatched sandals, climbed onto a wooden platform and passed around binoculars to witness the scene. They lived just a few kilometers away but had never seen such animals. Abel, 13, said he had already decided what he wants to be when he grows up. "Minister for Pendjari," he announced. "That's what's going to have an impact," said Djatto. "Children who will now grow up with the idea that they can find other jobs and not just work in the fields." — AFP

Germany's oldest bookseller, 95, packs suspense in last chapter

Then Helga Weyhe began work at her beloved bookshop, the Red Army was on the march towards her east German town, Hitler still clung to power and Sartre had just published "No Exit". Fast-forward more than seven decades and the remarkably spry 95year-old, Germany's oldest bookseller, swats away any talk of retirement, or even slowing down. Still staffing the store six days a week, Weyhe said books got her through two dictatorships and would see her through her last chapter too. "I started in 1944 and I'm still here," she told AFP with a smile, sitting in her back office stacked with handpicked volumes.

"I had lots of dreams when I was young but they always involved books." Weyhe represents the third generation of her family to run the shop, which has occupied the same spot since 1840. Her grandfather had the caramel-brown shelves built in the 1880s, when Otto von Bismarck ruled Germany. A tome about the life of the Iron Chancellor is propped among the political biographies, one of the specialties of Weyhe's eclectic selection ranging from French existentialists to German classics to Hollywood screenplays. Each volume in the shop carries Weyhe's endorsement, even if she hasn't read each cover to cover. She can't abide the towering identical stacks of the big chain stores. "You won't find mystery novels here either, not unless they're something special," she said sternly, reserving praise for Agatha Christie and German thriller writer Ingrid Noll.

'The most horrible thing' With World War II still raging, Weyhe

started working with her father Walter at his shop that still bears the

family name in the half-timbered house where they both were born. They ran it together under Soviet occupation and the East German communist state (GDR) and she took over in 1965, four years after the regime made them prisoners of the country behind the Iron Curtain.

"In the GDR the most horrible thing was getting used to it all, thinking: 'I won't live to see the day things change'," Weyhe said. That meant biding her time until East Germany's official retirement age-when travel restrictions for citizens were loosened-before she could go abroad to visit a favorite uncle, who ran a prominent bookshop on New York's Lexington Avenue. "Imagine what it's like as a young person having to wait until you're 60 to be able to travel," she said.

"Going to New York wasn't just any

trip-it was a dream come true." The Salzwedel shop is filled with pictures of the New York skyline, and a blue street sign with the address of her uncle's nowdefunct store greets customers as they enter. Last year Weyhe accepted a lifetime achievement prize from the German Booksellers' Association, which officially proclaimed her the country's oldest practitioner of the trade. "When I won, I said this isn't mine alone, it's for my family which has held on here for so long,"

She said Salzwedel, population 25,000, lying 200 kilometers (120 miles) northwest of Berlin, has long punched above its literary weight thanks to her shop. "I try to have books that amaze people and make them say 'you sell that in this little town?" Weyhe said. "That is why I draw cus-

tomers from far away-I like to say my clientele is from Boston to Bangkok," she added with a grin.

Not a 'missionary'

Longtime customer Klaus Schartmann, a pastor, believes Weyhe has a rare gift for sizing up a reader. "She always hits the nail on the head with her recommendationsfrom children's books to adult literature," the 78-year-old said. "And we're happy because you don't really find that in German bookstores anymore-only in Salzwedel." In the land where Gutenberg invented the printing press in the 15th century, customers are increasingly going online for their book purchases, with sales rising more than five percent in 2016. Meanwhile bookshops, particularly those on high streets rather than in shopping

malls, saw a one-percent decline in turnover, continuing a decade-long trend, according to industry data.

Weyhe believes in the power of books to edify and uplift, as the far-right Alternative for Germany (AfD) party makes major inroads in the region. Although she doesn't see her shop serving a "missionary" purpose in leading customers away from political extremes, she does make a point of selecting books that open minds. "In the post-war years I mainly stocked German history books so people here would know what actually happened," she said. "I simply don't sell the kind of books now that strengthen the AfD," she said, pointing to recent bestsellers that whipped up fears of mass migration. — AFP

the night before the Grammy awards, Jay-Z took the stage at a New York dinner attended by music industry titans to discuss his complex relationship with music's highest honors, where the odds are historically stacked against hip-hop artists winning top accolades. Jay-Z, who was honored by the Recording Academy at veteran music producer Clive Davis' annual pre-Grammy party on Saturday, spoke about his decision to boycott the Grammy awards in 1998 when rapper DMX did not get any nominations despite having two hit albums out that year.

Jay-Z said he only returned to the awards show in 2004, when Beyonce, to whom he is now married, was nominated for her breakout solo album. "The Academy, they're human like we are and they're voting on things that they like, it's subjective ... we care because we're seeing the most incredible artists standing on that stage and we aspire to be there, so I was like, I have to be here," the rapper said. "It's our duty to make sure that not only are we making the greatest art, that we're upholding and supporting things that are super real," he added.

Jay-Z, 48, went into yesterday's Grammy awards with a leading eight nominations for his emotional, soul-baring album "4:44," in which he examine the infidelity that was so



scathingly detailed by Beyonce in 2016's "Lemonade," as well as searing commentary on race in America. The rapper has won 21 Grammy awards over his career.

In 60 years of the Grammys, only two hip-hop albums have ever won album of the year; Lauryn Hill's "The Miseducation of Lauryn Hill" in 1999 and Outkast's "Speakerboxxx/The Love Below" in 2004. Brooklyn native Jay-Z, real name Shawn Carter, made his breakout with 1996's "Reasonable Doubt" and has become one of the bestselling US musicians and respected rap lyricists. He was honored on Saturday for not only reshaping rap over his career but also as an entrepreneur, including reshaping the music business with his

streaming service Tidal. Singer Alicia Keys said Jay-Z's music was "the sound-track to my life" growing up and she sang a medley of his hits including "Hard Knock Life," "Encore" and their New York anthem, "Empire State of Mind." — Reuters

In Detroit, Motown nights are reborn

vive years after Detroit declared itself bankrupt, nightlife in Motown is hopping again. Nightclubs and bars mixing the Midwestern city's African American musical heritage and a bubbling new creativity are sprouting up like mushrooms. And even Aretha Franklin, the Queen of Soul herself, wants a piece of the action unfolding from Corktown, behind the city's train station, through Midtown and all the way to the business district. Pop-up restaurants in local watering holes compete with live music venues offering rock, pop, dance, hip-hop, jazz, funk and folk in a vibrant cocktail reflecting the city's indelible influence on the American music scene


"Detroit is on a boom right now," said Troy Ramroop, owner of The Grasshopper Underground, an electro music club that has produced several hip DJs. He said that not long ago, clubbers in Michigan had to go to Chicago or New York to party all night. "But now you can drive 20 minutes and find it," said Ramroop. 'You have a lot to do here in the city. It's always been (that) music is everywhere. It's good music," said clubgoer Shari Staples, who was hanging out at the Northern Lights Lounge on a cold January night. The downtown club features performances by Dennis Coffey, one of the guitarists with The Temptations-an icon of the Motown record label in the 1960s and 1970s. "You get a lot of musicians. That's the heart of the DNA in Detroit," said Coffey.

Well-lit streets

Working with a firm called Bedrock Real Estate, hometown girl Franklin-she of "Respect" fame-wants venue appropriately called Aretha's. The project is said to be in its infancy. This is all a far cry from the sad, ugly days when Detroit filed for bankruptcy protection in 2013, crushed by some \$18 billion in debt. From a musical standpoint, Detroit is now more like the city that was celebrated in Jack Kerouac's Beat generation novel "On the Road" and, through Motown Records, gave rise to stars such as Stevie Wonder, the Jackson 5, Marvin Gaye, and Diana Ross and The Supremes.

To get all this done, the city and billionaire Dan Gilbert, owner of the Cleveland Cavaliers basketball team, have done tons of work to renovate the downtown area and lure banks like JPMorgan and companies such as Twitter, Microsoft, Nike and Whole Foods Market to set up shop there. Streetcars roll, new apartment buildings are popping up, and most streets are now well-lit, with surveillance cameras set up-some of them connected directly to police stations. The bottom line is that the city's population decline has slowed and crime is down. The number of homicides in 2017 was the lowest in 51 years. City Hall has created a program to help small businesses and formed a special nightlife task force. "You can't have a successful city if, you know, everybody just goes to work and goes home," said Aaron Foley, who has been hired to pitch the city in a position called "chief storyteller."

"I think more than anything the population density helps. There are a lot more people living down here in midtown," said Zach Tocco, business manager of the Majestic Theatre, a 1,100-seat concert hall that has seen the likes of Jimmy Cliff, Fela Kuti and Patti Smith. Ramroop's parties are popular, but still he says he is just getting by. "We've tightened up on our bookings. We've cut our costs where we could and we survived," said the immigrant from South Africa. Graeme Flegenheimer, 26, wants to make his mark on the local

"In America, we don't have the cultural funding that France has, or Denmark, for example," said Flegenheimer, who used to work in advertising in Los Angeles and left to open a spot called El Club. The venue is located in refurbished warehouse space, with graffiti and street art streaking the walls. It is aimed at "all ages." El Club has earned some street cred-cult movie director John Waters, known for films like "Pink Flamingos" and "Hairspray," celebrated his 71st birthday there last year. — AFP





'Cameron Post' wins top prize at Sundance

he Miseducation of Cameron Post,' a powerful drama about the real-life controversial practice of gay conversion therapy, came away with the top prize as the Sundance Film Festival wrapped Saturday. Starring Chloe Grace Moretz, it delighted and shocked audiences at its world premiere in the Utah mountains with its story of a teenage girl forced into therapy after being caught having a sexual encounter with the prom queen. "On behalf of the entire 'Cameron Post' team we want to dedicate this to the LGBTQ survivors of sexual conversion therapy," said Moretz.

"We just wanted to make this movie to shine a light onto the fact that it is only illegal in nine states out of the 50 states in this country to practice sexual conversion therapy." Its director Desiree Akhavan had pre-recorded an acceptance speech for the grand jury prize in Sundance's "US dramatic competition" section but it could not be played on a night beset by technical difficulties. "Kailash," about one

man's crusade to end child slavery, won best US documentary while the US dramatic audience award-the second prize to the grand jury awardwent to Andrew Heckler's "Burden." The US documentary directing prize went to Alexandria Bombach for "On Her Shoulders,"-a portrait of a Yazidi girl who survived sexual slavery at the hands of the Islamic State group-while the US documentary audience award went to "The Sentence." "Butterflies" came away with the grand jury prize for world drama while "Of Fathers and Sons," a



study of jihadi radicalization in the home, from celebrated Syrian filmmaker Talal Derki, won the world cinema documentary competition. The Sundance Film Festival, founded by actor Robert Redford, is considered a showcase for independent and documentary films, and festival winners often go on to receive critical acclaim and Hollywood awards season glory.

Among the titles from the 2017 edition of the festival picking up trophies at Hollywood's various ceremonies are Jordan Peele's "Get Out," which played out of competition as a midnight screening. The dark comedy has four Oscar nominations, including best film, director and screenplay "Call Me by Your Name," which director Luca Guadagnino took to last year's Sundance, also has four Oscar nominations, including best picture.

Dee Rees's "Mudbound," picked up by Netflix for a considerable \$12.5 million at last year's festival, has Academy nods for adapted screenplay, supporting actress, cinematography and original song. "I love really how the entire community here at the festival is curious, adventurous and so eager to engage with one another in the dialogue," said Sundance Institute executive Keri Putnam. "But it all starts with the work. It's the work we see on the screens coming from such fresh, creative and independent perspectives."

Balkan rocker Bregovic pens love letters to dream of Sarajevo

hometown and muse Sarajevo is more than a city. It's a metaphor for a multicultural way of life that can be torn apart by religious conflict. "What we see in Europe today, we saw first in Sarajevo: a neighbor, who one day is a good neighbour, the next day shoots you because you're of another religion," he tells AFP. "Sarajevo has always been my first metaphor. Today it's not just the name of a city. It's a metaphor for our times.'

The 67-year-old dedicates his latest album, "Three Letters from Sarajevo", to fragile religious harmony as well as to his native city, the Bosnian capital. A demanding world tour this year will see the celebrated musician-known for fusing rock, gypsy brass and folk stylesperform his new songs on around 130 stages

or Balkan rock star Goran Bregovic, his with his Weddings and Funerals Orchestra. ("White Button"), one of the leading lights of 'I'm not someone who does video for YouTube, who does TV. I'm old-fashioned... I travel the whole world to introduce my album," he tells AFP with a smile at his studio in Belgrade, as lively trumpeting drifts in from the next room. His new tracks feature world stars including Israeli musicians Asaf Avidan and Riff Cohen, Algerian punk icon Rachid Taha and Spanish singer Bebe, alongside three pieces for violin and orchestra. The violin is also a metaphor, he explains, owing to its three principal and very different styles traditionally played by Christians, Jews and Muslims.

'Sisyphean task'

Guitar player Bregovic rose to fame in the 1970s with his progressive band Bijelo Dugme rock in the former Yugoslavia. His buoyant scores for films by Serbian director Emir Kusturica, such as "Time of the Gypsies" (1988), helped to cement his role in the global popularization of Balkan music-as did his collaborations with Iggy Pop and other musical megastars. When Yugoslavia fell apart in a series of bloody inter-ethnic wars in the early 1990s, Bregovic, unlike a number of other artists, refused to take a side.

"My father was a Catholic Croat, my mother is an Orthodox Serb, my wife is Muslim," he says. "I was not in the position to hate anyone. I was sad for everyone else." In a scene from a 1991 documentary that he replays in the new album's trailer, a young Bregovic sits in central Sarajevo as music rings out from "mosques,

churches, cathedrals" at midday. "It would be a shame," he says in the video of the religious coexistence, "if it has to stop one day". "This was a video I made a year before the war. The sad thing is that there you see a young man saying that, but I'm doing the same thing at

67," he tells AFP. "More than 20 years later, I repeat the same thing in Three Letters from Sarajevo. "It's a Sisyphean task, but I feel that even this Sisyphean task makes sense. You have to work hard, push that stone... and maybe in the end it'll happen." — AFP

Rare 'super blood blue mon' visible on Jan 31

cosmic event not seen in 36 years-a rare "super blood blue moon"-may be glimpsed January 31 in parts of western North America, Asia, the Middle East, Russia and Australia. The event is causing a buzz because it combines three unusual lunar events an extra big super moon, a blue moon and a total lunar eclipse. "It's an astronomical trifecta," said Kelly Beatty, a senior editor at Sky and Telescope magazine. A blue moon refers to the second full moon in a month. Typically, a blue moon happens every two years and eight months.

This full moon is also the third in a series of "super series of series of "super series of series of super series of series of series of super series of series of

This full moon is also the third in a series of "supermoons," which happen when the moon is closest to Earth in its orbit. This point, called the perigee, makes the moon appear 14 percent larger and 30 percent brighter. During the eclipse, the moon will glide into Earth's shadow, gradually turning the white disk of light to orange or red. "That red light you see is sunlight that has skimmed and bent through Earth's atmosphere and continued on through space to the moon," said Alan MacRobert of Sky and Telescope magazine. "In other words, it's from all the sunrises and sunsets that ring the world at the moment." The alignment of the sun, moon and Earth will last one hour and 16 minutes, visible before dawn across the western United States and Canada. Those in the Middle East, Asia, eastern Russia, Australia and New Zealand should look for it in the evening, as the moon rises. Unlike a solar eclipse, this lunar eclipse can be safely viewed without protective eyewear.

How rare?

"We've had a lot of supermoons and we've had lunar eclipses, but it's rare that it also happens to be a blue moon," said Jason Aufdenberg, associate professor of physics and astronomy at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University's campus in Daytona Beach, Florida. "All three of these cycles lining up is what makes this unusual," he added. "It's just a wonder to behold." According to Sky and Telescope magazine, "the last time a complete lunar cover-up took place on the



second full moon of the month was December 30, 1982, at least as reckoned by local time in Europe, Africa, and western Asia-locations where the event could be seen."

That event also occurred at the moon's orbital perigee, making it an extra bright supermoon. Aufdenberg said that by his calculations, the last time a supermoon, blue moon and total lunar eclipse all together were visible from the eastern United States was on May 31, 1844. According to Sky and Telescope, the last blue moon total lunar eclipse visible from

North America happened on March 31, 1866. "But on that date the moon was near apogee, its most distant point from Earth," it said. Lunar eclipses during a supermoon happen rather regularly.

The last one was in September 2015. Lunar eclipses occur at least twice a year. Supermoons can happen four to six times a year. The next supermoon lunar eclipse visible throughout all of the United States will be January 21, 2019—though that one will not be a blue moon.—AFP

Nutella discount causes riots

A supermarket caused a frenzy after slashing Nutella by 70 per cent. The French chain Intermarche cut the price of the chocolate spread brand and hundreds of people rushed to the shop to stock up on as much as they could. A video was posted online showed the long queues forming outside as people patiently waited to get



inside and get their hands on several jars of the spread. An employee told local media: "People just rushed in, shoving everyone, breaking things. It was like an orgy. We were on the verge of calling the police." The chain - who has now apologized to customers - usually sell Nutella for €4.50 but the discount jars were going for around Å1.41 - equalling at around £1.24.

Unhygienic bellybuttons can lead to infections

Unclean bellybuttons can lead to cysts erupting. Bacteria from sweat, dead skin or dirt can be left to grow in the folds of skin and if personal hygiene isn't good, an unpleasant smell can turn into a combination of redness, itching and swelling. According to experts, the best way to avoid this condition also known as candida - is to wash and dry the bellybutton



area daily. Candida is also found in the armpits, groin or the bellybutton and left untreated erupting cysts, blisters and pus will form. Anyone with bellybutton piercings or are overweight are at an increased risk of getting the infection as the area is harder to clean, according to The Sun Online. —Bang Showbiz

Indonesian authorities run 'two-faced' car off the road

double-ended car owned by a septuagenarian mechanic from Indonesia has been ordered off the road, but he has not given up on the quirky creation just yet. Roni Gunawan built the "two-faced" car with the help of colleagues in Bandung, West Java province, by welding together the front halves of two orange Toyota Limos. The head-turning vehicle-which took about three-and-a-half months to build-has two engines, two steering wheels and two sets of pedals.

Its dual features make it particularly easy to park, Gunawan told AFP. But the 71-year-old's dream has hit a serious speed bump: local authorities have ticketed him, saying he lacks the necessary permits for the modifications. Despite the setback, Gunawan has vowed to get the vehicle roadworthy so it can see another day. "I will not be making a second," he said. "It's new in Indonesia-two faces, two machines."— AFP
