Lawmaker threatens to grill oil minister over alleged graft

KUWAIT: Head of the National Assembly's committee for the replacement of expatriates in public sector jobs MP Khalil Al-Saleh said yesterday the panel is determined that the replacement of all expatriates in government jobs must be completed by 2023 in accordance with a government plan. Saleh said that at present around 80,000 expatriates hold government jobs based on official contracts, forming around 20 percent of all government employees. But he said many other expatriates also work in government jobs but are not counted among the 80,000 contract employees.

Commenting on the government's vision which said that the replacement of expatriates may not be completed before 2028, the lawmaker claimed some advisors are obstructing Kuwaitization plans in the government. "We are not questioning their intentions, but some have been slowing the process on purpose," he said, noting that citizens are well-qualified and that all they need to dominate various jobs is to have more trust in their potentials and administrations that fully believe in depending on citizens instead of expats in doing administrative jobs.

Saleh said the replacement policy, which began in 1997, required each ministry and government department to shed 10 percent of its expatriate employees every year to create jobs for Kuwaitis. The percentsaid Kuwaitis can easily replace expats in jobs such oil sector, they should quit.

Saleh blamed the government for failing to implement replacement plans and demanded that those who failed to carry out such plans be exposed. He said the committee will demand studies and statistics made by the government in this connection and threatened to publicly question those responsible for delaying replacement plans.

Meanwhile, MP Omar Al-Tabtabaei yesterday said he will grill Oil Minister Bakheet Al-Rasheedi if he does not confront and control what he described as a "gang" in the oil sector. The lawmaker claimed that corruption is widespread in the oil sector and called on the prime minister to meet leading oil executives and review questions by MPs to see the extent of corruption in the vital sector.

He also claimed that millions of dinars in public funds have been squandered by leading oil executives through illegally reimbursing annual leaves. Tabatabei alleged that there is a "mafia" in the oil sector and advised the prime minister to read opinions by top executives about corruption. Qatar asks US to investigate 'financial war'

LONDON: Qatar has asked US regulators to investigate the US subsidiary of the largest bank in the United Arab Emirates, accusing it of "bogus" foreign exchange deals designed to harm its economy as part of a blockade by Gulf neighbors. The Central Bank of Qatar's law firm has written a letter to the US Treasury asking it to investigate NBAD Americas, the US subsidiary of First Abu Dhabi Bank (FAB), which is majority state-owned.

In a second letter, the lawyers - Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison - asked the US Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) to investigate possible manipulation of Qatar's currency, the riyal. The request for an investigation deepens the diplomatic crisis that erupted in June when Saudi Arabia, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates (UAE)

Turkish forces and Syrian allies drive **Kurds from Afrin**

AFRIN, Syria: Turkey's flag was flying in Afrin yesterday after its troops and Ankara-backed rebels chased out Kurdish militia forces to seize control of the Syrian city. In a major victory for Ankara's two-month operation against the Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG) in northern Syria, Turkish-led forces pushed into Afrin apparently unopposed, taking up positions across the city. The advance came as Syria's civil war entered its eighth year this week with heavy fighting on two fronts around Afrin and in the rebel enclave of Eastern Ghouta

Hundreds have been killed and thousands forced from their homes by the ferocious assault in Ghouta, where President Bashar Al-Assad yesterday visited troops battling to retake the last rebel enclave close to the capital. In Afrin, AFP correspondents saw Turkish forces and their Syrian allies in all neighborhoods of the city after they made a lightning advance inside yesterday.



Pulling no punches: Saudi woman boxer breaks exercise taboo

JEDDAH: Throwing punches in a gym tucked away from prying eyes, a Saudi female boxing trainer asserts a right long denied to many women in the conservative kingdom - the right to exercise. Halah Alhamrani, 41, runs a gym for women called FlagBoxing - its motto is Fight Like A Girl - in the western Red Sea city of Jeddah, offering fitness classes such as calisthenics, CrossFit, boxing and kickboxing.

Relying on word-of-mouth publicity in a country where exercising in public is culturally deemed unbecoming for women, Alhamrani is working to empower a generation with little to no exposure to sports. "On a daily basis, women who have never done sports walk into my class, some with their mothers," Alhamrani told AFP at her gym, which opened in 2016. "They walk out more confident. Many find their voice. The mothers approach me and say: Thank you for offering such an empowering feeling'."

At first blush, the gym screams California, not Saudi Arabia. Wearing headbands and workout attire, women are seen lifting weights, practicing sparring techniques and pounding their fists into a punching bag. Some of them crumple up their abaya gowns and toss them into a locker. They sweat it out over thumping music. Around 150 women, including Saudis but also other Arabs, share a sense of camaraderie. A note scribbled on a whiteboard reads: "I can't wait to come back!"

Another banner on the wall reads "BADASS". "It sometimes feels like a tea party - without the tea and cookies," Alhamrani jokes.

Women exercising in public were long a potential target for the kingdom's austere religious police, which has largely been neutered in recent years. But dramatic social reforms sweeping Saudi Arabia, including a historic decree allowing women to drive from June, have shone the spotlight on figures such as Alhamrani who have long fought isolated battles for basic freedoms.

Under Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman's Vision 2030 reform plan, the government is seeking to

Plan to revive **Dead Sea** edges closer to reality

GHOR AL-HADITHA, Jordan: Israel and Jordan have long pursued a common goal to stop the Dead Sea from shrinking while slaking their shared thirst for drinking water with a pipeline from the Red Sea some 200 km away. Geopolitical tensions have stalled efforts to break ground on the ambitious project for years, but the end of the latest diplomatic spat has backers hoping a final accord may now be in sight. The degradation of the Dead Sea, on the border of Israel, Jordan and the Palestinian West Bank, began in the 1960s when water began to be heavily diverted from the Jordan River.

"Before 1967, the water was just a 10-minute walk from my house," said Musa Salim Al-Athem, a farmer who grows tomatoes on the banks on the Jordan side. "Now it takes an hour," he said, standing amid the

resulting lunar landscape of spectacular salt sculptures, gaping sinkholes and craters. "Only the sea can fill up the sea." "Since 1950, the amount flowing in the Jordan has dropped from 1.2 billion cubic metres per year to less than 200 million," said Frederic Maurel, an engineering expert at the French development agency AFD.

Heavy production of potash, used for making fertilizer, has also accelerated evaporation that has seen the sea's surface area shrink

by a third since 1960. Experts say water levels are falling one metre a year, and warn it could dry out completely within 30 years. Already 100 years ago, Theodor Herzl, the father of modern political Zionism, had envisaged filling the Dead Sea via a canal dug to the Mediterranean.

The sea's natural beauty and mineral-rich black mud have also provided a source of tourism revenue.

Education Ministry unionist urges CSC to rethink expats' termination

'Kuwaitis reluctant to work as social workers'

KUWAIT: Head of the Ministry of Education's (MoE) employees syndicate Saleh Al-Azmi yesterday urged the Civil Service Commission (CSC) to undo its decision to terminate 214 expat psychological and social workers working in various public schools without providing qualified Kuwaiti substitutes. Azmi argued that CSC made a 'hasty' decision without studying its possible consequences on the educational process, especially in view of the lack of specialized and qualified Kuwaiti citi-

"Education cannot be run by individual decisions made by CSC in disregard to MoE's actual needs," he stressed, pointing out that citizens have been reluctant to work as psychological and social workers with MoE due to salary problems, as they are not paid as much as Kuwaiti teachers, and prefer working in other ministries. Finally, Azmi urged CSC to provide MoE's needs of staff and not terminate any teacher or social worker without providing well-qualified substitutes.

Local recruitment

Meanwhile, MoE's human resources manager Saud Al-

Juwaiser said the ministry has opened local recruitment of non-Kuwaiti teachers to join its teaching staff for the 2018-2019 school year. He added that bedoon applicants Kuwaiti announcers is 87 and underlined that the ministry is

will be exempted from the experience condition. Juwaiser explained that male teachers of English, French, mathematics, chemistry, biology, physics, geology, art and craft were needed, while female teachers were only needed to teach physics, mathematics, art and music. He also noted that applicants' age should not exceed 45, except for physical education teachers, who should be older than 32. He

stressed that certificates must be endorsed and that visitors' applications will be ignored.

Info Ministry

Undersecretary of the Ministry of Information Tareq Al-Marzam denied reports that any of the ministry's announcers have been suspended. He also noted that Kuwaiti

announcers from outside the ministry were temporarily hired based on need. Marzam said the total number of non-

> fully committed to the government's Kuwaitization plans. "The total number of Kuwaiti employees by the end of 2016 was 6,937 (86 percent) while non-Kuwaitis working on contracts were 311, and those working on temporary contracts only renewable by CSC approval number 884," he explained, concluding that expat employees in the ministry are only 14 percent of the total.

Health insurance scheme

The State Audit Bureau rejected a tender made by the Ministry of Health (MoH) to qualify companies to register subscribers in the expats' health insurance scheme because the ministry violated the procedural regulations included in directive number 4/1997 pertaining government biddings and opening bid offers. Addressing MoH,

the bureau stressed that bids can only be opened in the presence of the full quorum of the purchases committee. It also noted that some of the applying companies had filed complaints regarding the process and stressed that all bidding companies are entitled to a copy of the committee's report, which was not done with the complaining company. Accordingly, informed sources urged Health Minister Sheikh Dr Basel Al-Sabah and his undersecretary Dr Mustafa Redha to form an investigation committee to hold whoever is responsible accountable. Notably, former MoH assistant undersecretary for public services Dr Mahmoud Abdul Hadi had filed related complaints with the public prosecutor against a former health minister and his assistant undersecretaries for financial and legal affairs.

Military laws

First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense urged lawmakers to review four military-related laws including the martial court and military penalties law number 119/1996, the martial penalties and military litigations and procedures law number 77/2000, a bill on banning the use, production and storage of chemical weapons and a bill on amending article 5 of law number 24/1963 pertaining the supreme defense council.

No expired stents used

KUWAIT: Diseases Hospital's Director Dr Reem Al-Assousi stressed that cardiac catheterization surgeries conducted by the hospital's surgeons were completely safe and highly efficient. She also strongly denied that hospital doctors had ever used expired stents on any patient.



Southern power plant's renovation

KUWAIT: Kuwait's Minister of Oil and Minister of Electricity and Water Bakheet Al-Rashidi signed a deal worth KD 20 million (\$60 million) yesterday to refurbish units in the country's southern "Al-Zour" power station. The contract entails complete renovations to the power plant, where all equipment would be upgraded to ensure maximal energy efficiency, read a statement by the ministry of oil and electricity. The statement also put a 60-month timeframe on the contract. — KUNA

Kuwait committed

to Morocco quota

RABAT: The State of Kuwait has fulfilled in full its quota of the Gulf grant worth \$1.25 billion to Morocco, Kuwaiti Ambassador in Rabat Abdullatif Al-Yahya said on Saturday. The ambassador made the statement on the sidelines of a meeting between Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development's (KFAED) Director General Abdulwahab Al-Bader and Moroccan Minister of Economy and Finance Mohammad Bou Saeed. The meeting was to assess the projects funded by KFAED in Morocco. Yahya added that the Kuwaiti portion was given to Morocco by KFAED through financing several social and economic projects aiming to improve living conditions of many categories of Moroccan people. — KUNA

Tons of foul food confiscated in recent crackdowns

KUWAIT: Public Authority for Food and Nutrition inspectors confiscated 2,635 kg of foul fish during a recent crackdown at the fish market. They also issued 12 warning notices for violating cleanliness and health rules, said Capital inspection manager Abdul Rahman Al-Fares.

Meanwhile, Ahmadi inspectors inspected Mina Abdullah, Khairan and Nuwaiseeb markets, where they confiscated and destroyed 25 kg of foul meat, fish and chicken, said the team's manager Saud Al-Jallal, noting that the team also filed eight citations and six warning notices.

In Farwaniya, inspection teams inspected a number of stores, restaurants and cafes at Ardhiya industrial area and Riggae, where they filed 15 citations for violations including handling food items without having health certificates and violating cleanliness conditions. Inspectors also confiscated four kilograms of inedible food during a recent inspection tour in Fahaheel. They also issued citations for several violations detected during the tour.

Senior citizens

Health Minister Sheikh Dr Basel Al-Sabah approved providing senior citizens with special amenities including using 'priority' cards issued by the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor (MSAL) in various Health Ministry facilities. Sheikh Basel also issued a decision on forming a nursing team at each hospital to follow up discharged patients - namely senior citizens - and contact them through mobile phones to check on their conditions.

Three car break-in suspects arrested

KUWAIT: Farwaniya detectives arrested three people responsible for at least 17 robberies in which they broke into cars parked in various areas around Kuwait and stole their contents. Car owners had reported that their vehicles were targeted at the Friday Market in Rai, as well as the parking lots of Farwaniya, Amiri and Sabah Hospitals, in addition to the courts complexes in Regaei and Jahra, Mubarakiya Market and Ardhiya Industrial. Detectives monitored the places where the robberies were reported, and were able to identify two Arab men as prime suspects after they were seen frequenting those locations. The two men were arrested and taken for questioning, during which they admitted to committing the robberies. They led police to a third suspect who they said they have

Meanwhile, the air arm of the Kuwaiti military travelled to neighboring Saudi Arabia yesterday to participate in a pan-Gulf exercise, which kicks off today and ends on April 16. The Commander of the Kuwaiti Air Force Major General Abdullah Al-Foudari bid farewell to the officers upon their departure, read a statement by Kuwait's defense ministry. The drill, christened, 'Joint Gulf Shield 1', focuses on war preparedness and exercises that aim to boost the Gulf region's collective military prowess, the statement added.




Crackdowns

The Interior Ministry's relations and security information department said the general security sector carried out several campaigns in all governorates from March 11 to 17, 2018 - 315 checkpoints were set up, resulting in the arrest of 253 persons for felony and civil cases, 597 residency violators, 44 fugitives, as well as 77 illegal workers and roaming vendors. Seventy drugs cases were recorded and 1,424 traffic citations were issued, while 109 vehicles were impounded and 18 cars wanted by authorities were recovered.





Putin on track for a commanding victory

Opinion polls give Putin around 70% support

UST-DJEGUTA: Russians vote in a presidential election yesterday expected to give Vladimir Putin an easy victory, though the Kremlin could miss out on the resounding mandate it wants if large numbers, bored by a one-sided contest, do not bother to vote. Opinion polls give Putin, the incumbent, support of around 70 percent, or nearly 10 times the backing of his nearest challenger.

Another term will take him to nearly a quarter century in power - a longevity among Kremlin leaders second only to Soviet dictator Josef Stalin. Many voters credit Putin, a 65-year-old former KGB spy, with standing up for Russia's interests in what they view as a hostile outside world. A row with Britain over allegations the Kremlin used a nerve toxin to poison a Russian double agent in a sleepy English town - denied by Moscow - has not dented his standing.

"I voted for our liberator, Putin," said Alexander Kiryukhin, a 79-year-old in the city of Simferopol, Crimea. Russia's annexation of the region from Ukraine in 2014 earned Putin condemnation from Western governments and admiration from many Russians. "He sorted our lives out, he's irreplaceable for the state," said Kiryukhin. Putin's opponents alleged officials were trying to inflate the turnout, by opening up stalls selling discounted goods at polling stations, and instructing state employees to report back to their bosses that they had voted. Reuters reporters witnessed multiple people in different locations voting

in groups, and then taking photos of themselves in front of the ballot boxes on their mobile phones.

In polling station 1515 in Zelenodolsk, 800 km east of Moscow, five people photographed themselves voting. Asked

by a Reuters reporter why, one of the group, a young woman, said: "What do you mean why? It's a photographic report for our bosses." At polling station number 216 in Ust-Djeguta, in the Karachayevo-Cherkessia region of southern Russia. Marina Kostina was marshalling groups of voters to be photographed. Asked why one woman was photographed, Kostina said: "Her work asked her to report in."

"They're herding the whole country to the polling stations," Roizman, a rare example of an elected official opposed to the Kremlin, said in a video blog. "It's degrading... We're not sheep."

Irina Kornienko, 68, was running a stall selling clothes at a school in Kemerovo, Siberia, that was hosting two polling stations. Her T-shirts were on sale for 200 roubles (\$3.48), and underwear for 50 roubles. She said she was given special incentives by the local government to set up her stall yesterday. "The administration told me I could sell my stuff at a lower price if I came here today. These prices aren't usually allowed. It's the same for the people selling food, the prices are much lower. But that's good for people here, life is hard," she said.—Reuters

Five Indians killed in cross-border shelling by Pakistani troops

SRINAGAR: Five members of an Indian family were killed and two injured by shelling from Pakistani troops yesterday along the Line of Control, the de facto border between India and Pakistan, according to army and police officials. Both sides were engaging in heavy shelling despite a 15-year-old ceasefire between the nuclear-armed rivals in the area, the officials said. Nine people were also wounded across the border in Pakistan-controlled Kashmir due to the shelling from India that began late Saturday night, Pakistani officials said yesterday.

Tension has been running high since an attack on an Indian army camp in India-controlled Kashmir last month in which six soldiers were killed. India blamed Pakistan for the attack and said it would make its rival pay for the "misadventure". The South Asian neighbors have fought two of their three wars since independence in 1947 over Muslimmajority Kashmir, which they both claim in full but rule in part. Indian Defense spokesman Lt Col Devender Anand said yesterday that Pakistani troops started the shelling around 7:45 in the morning.

"They are specifically targeting civilian areas," Anand said. "Army troops retaliated strongly and effectively to

silence Pakistani guns." Director General of Indian Police in Kashmir, S P Vaid said the five people were killed in the village of Devta Dhar when a shell hit the house of Choudhary Mohammad Ramzan. Ramzan, 45, his wife Malka Bi, 45, and three sons - Muhammad Rehman, 19, Muhammad Rizwan, 18, and Muhammad Razaq, 8 all died, Vaid said. Two of Ramzan's daughters - Nooren Akhtar, 14, and Marin Akhtar, 7, were critically injured in the incident and were airlifted to a hospital in Jammu, Vaid said. —Reuters

What next for rebels, civilians in Ghouta?

BEIRUT: As Russia-backed Syrian regime forces chip away at what remains of the last opposition bastion outside Damascus, experts say the future looks bleak for rebels there. What is likely to happen to these opposition fighters, most of whom hail from the area, as well as tens of thousands of civilians still inside the besieged enclave?

How do things stand?

Government forces have retaken 80 percent of the former rebel bastion since launching a blistering air and ground assault to retake it on February 18, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights says. They have split the remaining areas under rebel control into three separate pockets, each held by different opposition factions, the Britain-based monitor says. The rebel Jaish al-Islam group is isolated in a northern pocket around the main town of Douma, while hardliners from Ahrar al-Sham control a small area around the town of Harasta to the west. In the south, Faylaq al-Rahman holds the town of Arbin and surrounding territory. When fighting stops, negotiations are likely to determine the fate of opposition fighters and civilians there, analysts say.

"Fighting will stop at some point and they will negotiate," geography expert Fabrice Balanche said, adding that such talks could be prolonged. As it seeks to win back control of the country, the Assad regime has often sought evacuation deals in rebel-held areas after brutal bombardment campaigns or suffocating sieges. This was the case in the central city Homs in 2014 and in the northern city of Aleppo as regime forces retook full control of it in late 2016. These so-called "reconciliation" deals saw rebels evacuated to other parts of the country under opposition control, including the northwestern province of Idlib.

Will Ghouta see evacuation?

Eastern Ghouta's rebels have said they reject any evacuation, but on Friday announced they were prepared to hold direct United Nations-backed ceasefire talks with regime backer Russia. Thomas Pierret, another Syria analyst, said the rebels stood little chance against the onslaught, which the Observatory says has claimed more than 1,400 civilian lives in

However "excellent in urban warfare" Eastern Ghouta's rebels are, they "can't do much faced with the regime's fire power", he said. When fighting stops, talks will decide what becomes of the rebels-most of whom, Pierret said, originate from the region. Aron Lund, a fellow with the Century Foundation, said that makes evacuations particularly devastating.—AFP

Trump to host Crown Prince who has rocked the kingdom

US, Saudi leaders to deepen an already congenial relationship

WASHINGTON: Donald Trump will host Saudi Arabia's crown prince in Washington tomorrow, giving the president a receptive audience to denounce rival Iran and a chance to take stock of significant changes the prince is engineering in the kingdom. Ten months after the last face-to-face meeting between Trump and Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, in Riyadh, the 71year-old president and the 32-year-old strongman prince are expected to deepen an already warm and congenial relationship.

But they are also expected to take up major developments for Saudi Arabia, both internally and externally: the end of a ban on Saudi women driving, the unprecedented detention of dozens of people that was billed as a high-level anti-corruption purge, Saudi involvement in the war in Yemen, and the crisis with the Gulf state of Qatar. "It's jaw-dropping how many policy changes the Saudis have pursued at home and in the region since that last meeting," said Lori Plotkin Boghardt, a former CIA analyst now with the Washington Institute for Near East Policy.

"Many of these changes have touched US security interests." One example is the summit that the administration had hoped to host this year with the six countries of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), which could be difficult to arrange given the continuing crisis with Qatar. In June, Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) began an air and sea boycott against Qatar, which they accuse of financing terrorism and being overly friendly with Iran.

Prince Mohammed, known by his initials MBS, was named Crown Prince that month by his father, King Salman. Early on, the prince announced an ambitious "Vision 2030" initiative to build an economy less dependent on oil, while luring more foreign investment. Toward that end, Riyadh wants to greatly accelerate the pace of its civilian nuclear energy program. The goal: to build 16 reactors over the next 20 years, at a cost of some 80 billion euros (\$98 billion), according to officials and analysts.

As the Saudis pursue the technology needed to undertake the ambitious project, they are expected to play potential rivals against one another, reminding their American counterparts that China, Russia and France are also capable of filling their needs. "It would be virtually impossible for the Saudi government to accept terms that are less than what Obama gave the Iranians-the possibility of future enrichment," a source close to the Saudi government told AFP, referring to the nuclear deal between Tehran and world powers that was completed when Barack Óbama was still

Bloody war in Yemen

The United States and Saudi Arabia are historic allies. Ever since Franklin Delano Roosevelt met with King Abdul Aziz ibn Saud on a US naval ship in the Suez Canal

in 1945, every American president has carefully nurtured relations with the Saudi royal family. But the unstinting support Trump offered when he chose Riyadh as the destination of his first overseas trip as president brought the relationship to a new level. While Barack Obama said in 2015 that it was important "not to perpetuate any long-term confrontation with Iran, or to even marginalize Iran," Trump, who has repeatedly threatened to withdraw from the nuclear deal reached that year with Tehran, has chosen a very different path.

"Everywhere we go in the Middle East it's Iran, Iran, Iran," he said a few days ago. "Every problem is Iran." Even before setting foot on American soil, Prince Mohammed struck a scathing tone toward Iran in an interview with CBS, comparing the territorial ambitions of that country's supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei to those of Adolf Hitler in Nazi Germany. And he warned that if Iran were to develop a nuclear bomb, Saudi Arabia would do the same "as soon as possible." But critics are cautioning the White House not to blindly embrace every stance taken by the Saudi prince, particularly as concerns its role in the bloody civil war in Yemen.

Fighting between the Houthi movement, supported by Iran, and Yemeni government forces, backed by the Saudis and the UAE, has claimed nearly 10,000 lives and left the country on the verge of a disastrous famine. In an opinion column early this

US-Saudi Arabia partnership: A long affair

WASHINGTON: The longstanding relationship between the United States and Saudi Ārabia, its main Middle East ally, is founded largely on the exchange of American security for Saudi oil. As Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman heads to Washington for talks with President Donald Trump, here is a look over the partnership.

Partners since 1945

The discovery of vast oil reserves beneath Saudi sands in the late 1930s secured the kingdom's place as a vital partner for the energy-hungry United States. The two countries initiated diplomatic relations in 1940 during World War II. The partnership was sealed in 1945 at a historic meeting between thenking Abdul Aziz ibn Saud and US president Franklin D Roosevelt on board the USS Quincy as it cruised the Suez Canal. The agreement promised the kingdom military protection in exchange for access to oil.

Cooperation

When Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait in 1990, then-US president George H.W. Bush launched Operation Desert Storm that soon liberated the country. The United States used airbases in Saudi Arabia as vital staging posts, sending thousands of American troops into the kingdom. It was "a moment of unparalleled cooperation between two great nations," Bush said. In the years that followed, US-led coalition planes took off from Saudi bases to enforce no-fly zones in Iraq.

September 11

The 9/11 attacks that killed almost 3,000 people in the United States tested the US-Saudi relationship, with 15 of the 19 Al-Qaeda attackers from Saudi Arabia. Saudi Arabia condemned the attacks but was accused of secretly financing extremist militants. It refused to take part in retaliatory strikes on Al-Qaeda bases in Afghanistan in late 2001; Riyadh was also not part of the 2003 US-led invasion of Iraq that led to Saddam Hussein's downfall. Washington pulled most of its remaining troops from the kingdom from 2003 and transferred its regional military headquarters to Qatar, while continuing military cooperation with Rivadh.

Obama: A crisis of confidence

Simmering tensions between the administration of US president Barack Obama and Saudi Arabia came to a head when Riyadh refused in October 2013 a seat on the UN Security Council. It was an unprecedented act aimed at protesting inaction over the Syrian conflict, then in its third year. Riyadh, which backs rebels fighting against the regime of Syrian President Bashar Al-Assad, was angry that Obama pulled out of strikes against the Syrian regime a month earlier. The 2015 agreement over Iran's nuclear program further rattled the Sunni kingdom's confidence as it feared Washington was tilting towards its regional Shiite rival.

Total support under Trump

Riyadh has issued a series of laudatory comments about the Trump administration, which echoes its concerns about Iranian regional influence. Trump chose Saudi Arabia for his first foreign trip after taking office, arriving in May 2017 to much fanfare and ceremony. The partners announced major contracts worth more than \$380 billion-including \$110 billion for the sale of American arms to Saudi Arabia, aimed at countering what they see as a threat from Iran and radical Islamists. The allies also both accuse Iran of involvement in the Yemen conflict on the side of Houthi rebels. At the head of an Arab military coalition, Riyadh has since March 2015 deployed forces against the rebels, who captured the capital Sanaa in 2014. — AFP

Trump attacks FBI as his lawyer calls for an end to Russia probe

US president hails FBI official's firing

WASHINGTON: Donald Trump slammed the FBI as he hailed the firing of a veteran Bureau agent as a "great day for democracy," a move his attorney said he hoped would bring an end to a probe into alleged collusion between the president's campaign and Russia. Critics described the axing of Andrew McCabe-the deputy of former FBI director James Comey-as a "dangerous" ploy to discredit the top US law enforcement agency as well as the work of Robert Mueller, the special counsel investigating Russian influence in the 2016 election.

McCabe is a potential key witness in the Russia probe. Trump on Saturday via Twitter blasted the alleged "tremendous leaking, lying and corruption at the highest levels of the FBI, Justice & State." He also reiterated long-running criticism of the Mueller investigation, terming it a "witch hunt" and saying that it "should never have been started in that there was no collusion and there was no crime."

McCabe job offer

Earlier, Trump's personal attorney, John Dowd, told the Daily Beast that he hoped Deputy Attorney General Rod Rosenstein would follow the lead of the FBI Office of Professional Responsibility and "bring an end to alleged Russia Collusion investigation manufactured by McCabe's boss James Comey based upon a fraudulent and corrupt Dossier."

Dowd told the Daily Beast he was speaking for the president. But in a subsequent statement he said he had been "speaking for myself, not the president." McCabe, who has endured a year of withering attacks from Trump, was fired by the Justice Department late Friday, just two days before he was to retire after 21 years with the FBI. Critics say the firing is a step in Trump's plan to engineer Mueller's dismissal, potentially sparking a constitutional crisis.

Mueller is also examining whether Trump might have obstructed justice, including by fir-

ing Comey last May. One Democratic lawmak-

er, Mark Pocan of Wisconsin, announced

The Justice Department said an internal investigation had found that McCabe made unauthorized disclosures to the media, and had not been fully honest "on multiple occasions" with the department's inspector general.

"The FBI expects every employee to adhere to the highest standards of honesty, integrity and accountability," Attorney General Jeff Sessions said in a statement. Lack of candor under oath is a firing offense at the FBI, but the politicallycharged context of the move raised questions among McCabe's backers. Former CIA chief John Brennan lost his patience with Trump. "When the full extent of your venality, moral turpitude and political corruption becomes known, you will take your rightful place as a disgraced demagogue in the dustbin of history," he tweeted.

'Not political appointees' Trump, in an early afternoon tweet, belit-





tled the media for its coverage of the story, saying: "The Fake News is beside themselves that McCabe was caught, called out and fired..." In a second tweet he again denied any collusion with Russia. Details of the inspector general's probe were not made public, but it involved the FBI's handling of the 2016 investigation into Trump's election rival, Democrat Hillary Clinton. Trump has repeatedly accused McCabe and Comey of protecting Clinton from prosecution, including over her misuse of a private email server while she was secretary of state. The inspector general's probe was "part of an unprecedented effort by the administration, driven by the president himself, to remove me from my position,

destroy my reputation, and possibly strip me of a pension that I worked 21 years to earn," McCabe said in a statement.

"It is part of this administration's ongoing war with the FBI and the efforts of the special counsel investigation." But one law professor defended the Justice Department's investigators. "These are not political appointees," Jonathan Turley of George Washington University told CNN. "They clearly concluded that McCabe misled them-and that he misled them on one of the core issues they were investigating." The White House has shown mounting frustration with the collusion probe, as it focuses ever more closely on the president's inner circle.—AFP

News in brief

7 sentenced to death

DHAKA: A court in Bangladesh sentenced seven militants to death vesterday after finding them guilty of killing a shrine worker in 2015, court officials said. Bangladesh, a Muslim-majority country of 160 million people, is facing what appears to be a growing threat of militant violence and has seen a string of incidents in recent years. Shrine caretaker, Rahamat Ali, 60, was hacked to death in November 2015 in the northern district of Rangpur. Six others accused of the attack were acquitted by the court. The convicted men were members of the Jamaat-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh group, public prosecutor Rathish Chandra Bhowmik told reporters. —Reuters

Nations urged to quit ICC

MANILA: Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte yesterday urged other nations to follow his move to quit the International Criminal Court, which is examining his deadly drug war. Duterte lashed out at the war crimes tribunal days after his government notified the United Nations of his decision to withdraw the Philippines from the Rome Statute which set up the court. "I said withdraw simply because to announce to the world, and I will convince everybody now who (is) under the treaty: get out, get out. It is rude," Duterte said in a speech to Philippine Military Academy graduates. "It is not a document that was prepared by anybody. —AFP

Philippine hotel fire

MANILA: Three people were killed and 23 injured by a major hotel fire in the Philippine capital Manila yesterday, with others plucked by helicopter from the rooftop of the building engulfed in thick black smoke, authorities said. The blaze at the Waterfront Manila Pavilion, a high-rise hotel and casino complex, was still raging nine hours after it began yesterday morning, with two people missing as hundreds fled the area. Authorities initially said four people had died but later clarified that one victim had been revived in hospital, according to Metro Manila Development Authority acting chief Jojo Garcia. The three who died had likely suffocated while another 23 people had been taken to hospital, said Manila city's disaster risk reduction chief, Johnny Yu.—AFP

Fires rage in Australia

MELBOURNE: Homes were razed, cattle killed and large swathes of land burnt yesterday as bush and grass fires rage in Australia amid hot and blustery conditions, with residents fleeing flame-filled red skies. Dozens of blazes in western and southwestern Victoria state began on Saturday and a change in wind direction early Sunday worsened the situation. Some 40,000 hectares have been damaged, and "hundreds of beef and dairy cattle will be lost as a result of these fires", Victoria's Emergency Management Commissioner Craig Lapsley told reporters Sunday. Up to 12 homes were "impacted", he added, with broadcaster ABC reporting they were "destroyed". "We've got fires, major fires, running. —AFP

Sri Lanka ends emergency

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka's president announced yesterday he is lifting a nationwide state of emergency imposed 12 days ago to quell anti-Muslim riots in which three people died and hundreds of shops were destroyed. Maithripala Sirisena said improvements in the security situation prompted him to end the emergency, under which security forces and the police had sweeping powers to detain suspects. "Upon assessing the public safety situation, I instructed to revoke the state of emergency from midnight yesterday," Sirisena said on Twitter as he returned to the island after a tour of Japan. Much of the anti-Muslim violence was concentrated in the central district of Kandy, 115 kilometers northeast of the capital Colombo.—AFP

UK accuses Russia of secretly stockpiling deadly nerve agent

LONDON: British Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson said yesterday that Russia has been stockpiling the deadly nerve agent used to poison a Russian former double agent in England and has been investigating how such weapons can be used in assassinations. Britain has said Russia used the Soviet-era nerve agent called Novichok to attack Sergei Skripal and his daughter Yulia in the first known offensive use of such a weapon on European soil since World War Two. Russia has denied any involvement.

"We actually have evidence within the last 10 years that Russia has not only been investigating the delivery of nerve agents for the purposes of assassination, but has also been creating and stockpiling Novichok," Johnson told the BBC. Britain and Russia have each expelled 23 diplomats over the attack as relations between the two countries crash to a post-Cold War low. Skripal, a former colonel in Russian military intelligence who betrayed dozens of Russian agents to Britain, and his daughter are fighting for their lives after they were found collapsed on a bench in the city of Salisbury two weeks ago.

Officials from the world's chemical weapons watchdog will arrive in Britain today to investigate the samples used in the attack and the results should be known in about two weeks, Britain's foreign ministry said. The foreign ministry said that if Russia has been stockpiling nerve agents this would amount to a violation of the Chemical Weapons Convention, of which Moscow is a signatory.

Russia's ambassador to the European Union Vladimir



Chizhov told the same program that his country has destroyed its reserves of such substances and a British research laboratory could be the source of the nerve agent used in the attack. Johnson dismissed those claims and said Russia's reaction "was not the response of a country that really believes itself to be innocent".

"Their response has been a mix of smug sarcasm and denial and obfuscation," he said. Johnson said Britain's National Security Council will meet later this week to decide "what further measures, if any" may be taken, and that the government may decide to target Russian wealth in Britain.

The British capital has been dubbed "Londongrad" due to the large quantities of Russian money that have poured in since the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991. Some British lawmakers have urged Prime Minister Theresa May to freeze the private assets of senior members in Russian President Vladimir Putin's circle. Putin is expected to easily win a presidential election yesterday which would take him to nearly a quarter of a century in power. —Reuters

Angry islanders: Why France faces protests overseas

PARIS: A month-long campaign of strikes and protests on the French Indian Ocean island of Mayotte has shone a light on the simmering resentment in some of France's tropical outposts over perceived neglect by the state. Supplies of fuel, drugs and other essentials are running dangerously low on the island of 250,000 people off southeast Africa as protesters dig in for more funding-and empathy-from Paris.

The spice island in the Comoros archipelago, which has been governed by France since the mid-1800s, is the fourth overseas territory to be paralyzed by strikes over living conditions in the past decade. An attack by a gang on a school lit the fuse on frustration over mass migration and growing lawlessness in France's poorest department, which many link to the influx of arrivals by sea from neighboring non-French Comoran islands.

Visiting minister for overseas territories Annick Girardin failed to convince the demonstrators to abandon the barricades this week, despite a promise of police reinforcements to combat crime and a clampdown on illegal migration. "They made the same promises to our parents and grandparents," Toto Amachebane, head of a striking transport company, said dismissively. France's collection of overseas territories stretch from the islands of Wallis and Futuna in the South Pacific to Saint Pierre and Miguelon in the northwest Atlantic to Reunion island off Madagascar.

Attachment to the former colonial mothership is generally strong, particularly

in the five overseas departments of Martinique, Guadeloupe, French Guiana, Mayotte and Reunion island. But many in the scattered parts of overseas France complain of being made to feel like an afterthought. The development gap with the mainland is particularly striking in Mayotte, which broke ranks with the three other Comoros islands in voting against independence in the 1970s but was only

fully integrated into France in 2011. Unemployment of 25.9 percent is over double that in France as a whole and public services are woefully deficient: Mayotte had 18 doctors per 100,000 inhabitants in 2012, compared to an average of 201 in the rest of France. "There is a lot of impatience in Mayotte. Some people expected things would be settled in six months, but it's going to take a generation or two," Olivier Sudrie, an economist at BDE consultancy on governance told AFP. While poor in French terms, Mayotte is a beacon of prosperity for residents of the severely impoverished, coup-prone Comoros. In scenes reminiscent of the Mediterranean, thousands of Comorans pile into rickety boats to make the 70-kilometre (44-mile) crossing to Mayotte each year, including large numbers of pregnant women.

Migrant baby boom

"Mayotte has become an open-air Sangatte," Said Hachim, one of the protest leaders, told Le Monde newspaper this week, referring to an infamous migrant camp in northern France that was closed in 2002. Some 9,600 babies were delivered in Mayotte's hospital last year-a record for a French hospital-of which 70 percent were born to migrant parents hoping to secure French citizenship for their child. Schools are also bursting at the seams, creating resentment among locals who fear being further pauperised by the situation.

The government this week suggested giv-

ing Mayotte's hospital special "extra-territorial" status so that children born there would not automatically qualify for French passports. Half-way around the world, a wave of illegal immigrants has also piled pressure on public services in French Guiana, a vast, forested territory with an acute lack of schools and paved roads. Protesters shut down Kourou spaceport, a major launchpad for European satellites, for several weeks last year to demand a "takeoff plan" for the area.

'Not Father Christmas'

During a visit in October President Emmanuel Macron promised to limit benefits for newcomers "to reduce the attractiveness" of the territory. But he also declared he was "not Father Christmas" accusing previous governments of making

"too many unkept promises." In 2009, the then right-wing government agreed to a system of salary top-ups to offset high living costs in Guadeloupe and Martinique which were ground to a standstill by month-long general strikes.

The people of Mayotte insist they are not looking for handouts. "The Mahorais (Mayotte residents) fought to be French and to be free," Hachim, the protest leader told Le Monde. "We are not beggars," he said. For Claude-Valentin Marie, a sociologist at the French Institute for Demographic Studies, they just want what those on the mainland take for granted. "They want to be like other French departments in terms of education, economic activity, health and security," he said. "They no longer want to be the exception."—AFP

Southeast Asia, Australia 'gravely' concerned by North Korean nukes

ASEAN tackles Rohingya crisis, urge South China Sea calm

SYDNEY: Southeast Asian countries and Australia said yesterday they held "grave concerns" about escalating tension caused by North Korea's nuclear and missile programs and urged "irreversible" denuclearization. North Korea is pursuing its weapons programs in defiance of UN Security Council sanctions and has boasted of its plans to develop a missile capable of hitting the US mainland. It defends the programs as a necessary deterrent against perceived plans by the United States, which stations 28,500 troops in South

Korea, for invasion - a plan the United States denies.

"We strongly urge the DPRK to immediately and fully comply with its obligations under all relevant United Nations Security Council Resolutions," the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) and Australia said in a joint declaration, using the initials for North Korea's official name. The country's

nuclear and ballistic missile development "threaten regional and global security" the declaration added, calling for the "complete, verifiable and irreversible denuclearization" of the nation. Tensions have eased in recent weeks, coinciding with North Korea's participation in the Winter Olympics held in the South last month.

US President Donald Trump also announced surprise plans to meet North Korean leader Kim Jong Un before May, after Kim "committed to denuclearization", according to South Korea's National Security Office. "We are cautiously encouraged by these developments," Singapore Prime Minister Lee Hsein Loong told reporters in Sydney after the publication of the ASEAN declaration. "The situation on the Korean peninsula is a complicated problem which will take time to resolve, and we hope these recent steps will contribute to lasting peace and stability."

Rohingya crisis

Meanwhile, Australia and its ASEAN neighbors vowed to boost defense ties while stressing the importance of nonmilitarization in the disputed South China Sea yesterday at a summit where the "complex" Rohingya crisis took centre stage. Leaders from the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, at the three-day meeting in Sydney, also agreed to work more closely to tackle the growing menace of violent extremism and radicalization. But while a final communique

noted a resolve to "protect the human rights of our peoples", it failed to condemn member state Myanmar's treatment of the Muslim-minority Rohingya. Nearly 700,000 Rohingya have fled the troubled Rakhine state for Bangladesh since authorities launched a brutal crackdown six months ago that the UN has called "ethnic cleansing".

Myanmar, whose de-facto leader Aung San Suu Kyi was in Sydney, has vehemently denied the allegations."We discussed the situation in Rakhine state at considerable

length today," Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull said at a closing press conference. "Aung . San Suu Kyi addressed the matter comprehensively, at some considerable length herself," he said. "It's a very complex problem ... Everyone seeks to end the suffering that has been occasioned by the events, the conflict." Singapore Prime Minister Lee Hsien

Loong, said the crisis was "a concern for all ASEAN countries, and yet ASEAN is not able to intervene to force an outcome".



Tensions in the South China Sea remain a big worry for regional leaders, as Beijing continues to build artificial islands capable of hosting military installations-much to the chagrin of other claimants to the area. Vietnam remains the most vocal in the dispute with the Philippines backing off under China-friendly President Rodrigo Duterte. Taiwan, Malaysia and Brunei also have claims.

Canberra and ASEAN reaffirmed "the importance of maintaining and promoting peace, stability, maritime safety and security, freedom of navigation and overflight in the region", without naming Beijing. The leaders added they wanted to see an "early conclusion of an effective code of conduct in the South China Sea". "We will uphold our commitment to the rules-based order and international law n the region, including the South China Sea," stressed Turnbull. With China flexing its muscle, they also committed to enhancing "the scope and sophistication of defense cooperation", while expressing "grave concern" about escalating tensions on the Korean peninsula. Day two of the summit on Saturday was devoted to counter-terrorism, with an agreement to work together to tackle extremism

amid growing concern about the use of the "dark web", or encrypted messaging apps, by terrorists to plan attacks. Fears have been heightened by jihadists now being forced out of Syria and Iraq with the Islamic State caliphate most-

ly crushed, and into other countries. Malaysian Prime Minister Najib Razak cited the flow of the displaced Rohingya as a potential new security threat, with desperate people more susceptible to radicalization. —Agencies

Japan cult spinoffs persist two decades after sarin attack

TOKYO: More than two decades after Japan's Aum Shinrikyo cult plunged Tokyo into terror by releasing a nerve agent on rush-hour subway trains, its spinoffs continue to attract new followers. Cult head Shoko Asahara is on death row, along with 12 of his disciples, for crimes including the subway attack, which killed 13 people and injured thousands.

He was arrested in 1995 in the wake of the sarin attack, but the Aum cult survived the crackdown, renaming itself Aleph and drawing new recruits into its fold. Aleph officially renounced ties to Asahara in 2000, but the doomsday guru retains significant influence, according to Japan's Public Security Intelligence Agency. "It (Aleph) is a group that firmly instructs its followers to see Asahara as the supreme being," an agency investigator told AFP, speaking on condition of anonymity.

"If someone says 'guru Asahara wants to bring down Japan', there would be followers who would act. The group poses such a potential danger," he said. Raids on Aleph facilities have found recordings of his teachings as well as a device used by the Aum cult known as a

"Perfect Salvation Initiation", a type of headgear that emits weak electric currents which members believe connects them to Asahara's brainwaves.

Aleph and other splinter groups, which deny links to Asahara despite the claims of authorities, have 1,650 members in Japan and hundreds more in Russia, according to the Public Security Intelligence Agency. It says the groups attract around 100 new followers annually via yoga classes, fortune-telling and other activities that do not mention the cult's name, often targeting young people who do not remember the 1995 subway attack. Young female followers go to 'training' places with their children... We are worried there is an increasing number of children who have been inculcated by the Aum since they were very young," the investigator said.

Horrendous ordeals

Asahara and his wife Tomoko had four daughters and two sons, and most of the family remains within the cult. One daughter who left in 2006, aged 16, has described horrifying ordeals during her childhood, including being forced to eat food with ceramic shards in it and being left in the cold in little clothing. "It was an environment unthinkable in modern-day Japan. I was afraid I would be killed if I rebelled, so I felt tense, as if I were on a battleground, for 16 years," she said in a statement last year. "I strongly hope no more children will grow up in the Aum's successor groups." In early March, on Asahara's 63rd birthday, investigators were keeping their usual close eye on the headquarters of an Aum splinter group in a quiet Tokyo residential area. —AFP

Israeli army bombs Gaza 'underground' complex

JERUSALEM: Israel's military carried out an air raid overnight against an underground Hamas facility in the Gaza Strip and destroyed a separate tunnel under construction that could be used for attacks, it said yesterday. No casualties were reported in either operation, which came after an explosive device was detonated near the Gaza border with Israel, the latest in a string of such incidents. Israel's military said the operation to destroy the tunnel involved new technology it has been

developing to detect them. "Our policy is to act resolutely against any attempt to harm us and systematically eliminate the terror tunnel infrastructure, and we will continue doing so." Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said in a statement. Hamas, the Islamist movement that runs the Gaza Strip, called Israel's actions an attempt "to scare the people" and head off planned protests along the border beginning later this month. Israel "bears all the consequences of the escalation," Hamas spokesman Fawzy Barhoum said. Beginning on March 30, Gazans are planning to erect hundreds of tents near the Israeli border in a six-week show of support for Palestinian

Regarding the overnight operations, Israeli military spokesman Jonathan Conricus said Hamas had been digging the tunnel to link up with an older one in the south of the Palestinian enclave. The new tunnel had not reached Israeli territory but was within a few hundred meters of the border fence, near the Kerem Shalom goods crossing and in the area of the city of Rafah in the Gaza Strip, he said. The older tunnel did "partially" reach into Israeli territory, but had been discovered and cut off in 2014. —AFP

Free from Gaza's struggles, at least for a while

was born and grew up in Gaza. My father was a soccer coach for many years and his stories about his travels to Aother countries always made me want to travel too. But Israel imposed a land, air and sea blockade on Gaza in 2007 and has kept Gaza mostly closed ever since. So I never made it out until now, at age 31, I was allowed to leave - for just a little while.

I work for a global human rights organization and spent months seeking the exit permit from the Israeli government that would allow me to leave, to participate in security and research training sessions, to attend key organizational meetings, and to meet colleagues based just a short drive away in Jerusalem or Ramallah - to say nothing of those overseas. But I faced obstacles every step of the way to obtaining the documents and permissions I needed simply to get out of Gaza itself - until I got a phone call on Jan 28.

Someone who introduced himself as an employee of the Palestinian Authority's General Authority of Civil Affairs called to let me know that my permit had been approved and that I would travel in two days. I was in shock. The prospect of leaving the 25-by-7-mile territory for the first time in my life made me so anxious I could not sleep the night before my scheduled departure.

It didn't help knowing I would have to travel without my laptop, any food, or even shampoo and toothpaste, because Israeli authorities forbid Palestinians leaving Gaza from carrying any of these items. I also knew from talking to fellow Gaza residents who had missed out on scholarship opportunities or were prevented from obtaining necessary medical care that Israel could always bar me from leaving at the last moment without offering any reason at all.

My bus pick-up was scheduled for 6 am. I woke up early and headed out in the dark. When the bus arrived, I smiled. Then I cried. I can't describe the feeling. It was something more than happiness - maybe the feeling of peace or the taste of freedom. We went through the Erez crossing into Israel and then through Israel and the occupied West Bank to the Allenby Bridge border crossing, where we entered Jordan. I saw vast open green pastures and tall trees. As we passed Jerusalem's Old City, we could see the Dome of the Rock; we weren't allowed to stop to pray at the Al Aqsa mosque, but I managed to snap a quick photo from the bus window.

Though, as the crow flies, the distance between my home in the Gaza Strip and Jordan's capital is less than 100 miles, the trip took us 12 hours. I arrived in Amman at 6 pm, exhausted but happy. I got into a taxi, and opened the window. I felt like a prisoner released on bail, thrilled just to breathe unpolluted air and to see open space, so much light and no darkness. I walked Amman's streets, filming myself in videos talking about how it feels to breathe freedom for the first time, so I could bring these feelings with me when I returned home. I got my US visa and flew to New York a week later.

New experience

This experience has all been so new to me. During my first few days away, I'd wake up in the middle of the night to charge my phone before the next power cut, and then remember that, because I wasn't in Gaza, my life was not controlled by the electricity schedule. On the flight to New York, I had to ask the flight attendant where my tray table was, and how to find the bathroom, as I worried I'd accidentally open the door of the airplane.

And I may have been the only adult in New York City who was overjoyed to see the snow last week; I even went out and played in it. But I am slowly adjusting. I have proudly been taking the subway every day between Manhattan and Brooklyn, where I am staying with a colleague. When my co-workers went home at the end of our week of meetings, I felt sad, not knowing if I would ever see them again. They told me that they would see me next year, and I hope it's true.

Friends and family back home keep asking, "How's life outside Gaza?" I can't answer. How to tell people who live on four to six hours of electricity daily that high-rise buildings in New York leave their lights on 24 hours a day, simply because it looks nice? How it feels to live without generator noises, the deafening roar of Israeli military drones at night, or the constant fear of imminent conflict? Or that you can

hop on a bus, train or plane on a whim, without needing a permit, and travel across the world?

I know that I have been more fortunate than many Gazans, 70 percent of whom rely on humanitarian aid, primarily from the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (whose budget is now endangered by the Trump administration's decision to withhold much of its planned contribution in order to pressure the Palestinian Authority to join the its planned peace negotiations.) I graduated from college and, in a place where current unemployment rates hover around 40 percent for men and 70 percent for women, my father, sister and I all have jobs.

No one in my family has been harmed in any of the three military assaults Israel has launched during its armed conflicts with the Hamas-led Gaza authority since 2008, and our house hasn't been hit. And I know I probably could not have traveled if not for my organization's help. Still, I try not to think about how, later this month, I will enter the Erez checkpoint from the Israeli side and cross back into Gaza, unsure when, if ever, I will be allowed to leave again. It's easier to accept reality in Gaza when you haven't seen how oth-

China widens Xi's corruption crackdown

illions of Chinese public sector workers will be exposed to the harsh policing tactics of the Communist Party as President Xi Jinping brings his corruption crackdown to China's sprawling bureaucracy. The campaign to clean up the party's pervasive corruption has arguably been Xi's most popular initiative, pressuring its 89 million members to toe the line with more than 1.5 million officials punished in the past

Legislators are finalizing the creation of a new antigraft apparatus that will also watch over non-party members - everyone from managers at state-owned companies to people in administrative roles at schools and hospitals. In Beijing alone, one of the areas where the new system was established on a pilot basis, the number of people under scrutiny quadrupled to one million, or about five percent of the city's population, officials said.

New national and local "supervision commissions" investigative agencies focused on corruption - will operate alongside the Communist Party's Central Commission for Discipline Inspection (CCDI), sharing offices, personnel and perhaps leadership. Further blurring the line between the state and party bodies, the National People's Congress (NPC) yesterday named CCDI deputy secretary Yang Xiaodu as head of the National Supervision Commission.

The "anti-corruption powers are dispersed," explained one party leader during the NPC, saying the new body would harness and unify anti-graft efforts. Rights groups worry the new body will institutionalize some of the problems that have led to abuses and even torture of suspects, while vastly expanding the number of people under its purview. The system has a "veneer of legal legitimacy", said Maya Wang, China researcher at Human Rights Watch (HRW), without "any meaningful improvements to guarantee due process".

Held without lawyer

Maduro challenger shakes up Venezuela presidential vote

t each other's throats for two decades, militants of Venezuela's socialist state and opposition seldom agree on anything. Yet mention the name of presidential candidate Henri Falcon, and both are liable to spit. "Traitor!" cry socialist stalwarts, who cannot forgive the former state governor for breaking with their beloved late leader Hugo Chavez in 2010. "Chavista lite!" say opposition radicals, always suspicious that Falcon came into their ranks as a Trojan horse.

Now that the 56-year-old former soldier is running for president in a May 20 vote, both groups are united in scoffing at his chances. After all, Falcon is up against not just a powerful President Nicolas Maduro but also an election system widely considered unfair and an opposition boycott that will deprive him of votes. And yet, a clutch of opinion polls show Falcon ahead, bolstering his campaign mantra that he is a natural transition candidate with appeal to a moderate majority fed up with political polarization and economic chaos.

Widely-followed pollster Datanalisis, for example, put him more than 10 percentage points ahead in voter intentions. "This government is finished," Falcon told Reuters, noting how few governments in history had survived hyper-inflation and economic chaos like Venezuela's current crisis. Opinion surveys in Venezuela are often divergent, politicized and misleading in hindsight. But Falcon, his campaign team and some pundits think he may be able to create an avalanche as the campaign gets underway. "If we really unite, get organized, construct a single narrative, and instead of discouraging people by asking them to abstain, we call them to vote, there's no way this government can beat us," said Falcon.

Maduro's advantages

Despite such optimism and Maduro's unpopularity on the streets, there appear to be plenty of ways for the government to assure victory. It is ratcheting up welfare handouts and pressure on state workers, has skillfully

into the country's constitution last week and will approve a law laying out their powers on Tuesday. China's war on corruption has relied heavily on a shadowy, often brutal extralegal justice system known as "shuanggui", allowing investigators to hold party members in unofficial detention facilities until they "confess" to graft. At least 11 individuals died under shanggui custody between 2010 and 2015, according to a 2016 HRW report.

Xi said last year that the shuanggui system would be phased out and replaced. But the new law provides for a form of detention called "liuzhi", which rights groups say is a "legal" reincarnation of the shuanggui system and



allows graft suspects to be held for up to six months with no provision for legal counsel. In eastern Zhejiang province, shuanggui detention facilities are now being used as liuzhi centers, officials there said. Under liuzhi suspects' family members must be notified within 24 hours of their detention - except when they may "impede the investigation". "Liuzhi provides no fair trial protections, not even the basic ones that exist under China's criminal procedures," said Wang.

Chen Qian, 58, a researcher at Yangquan city's national development and reform commission in northern Shanxi province, was one of the first public servants to face investigation by a new supervision commission. Last year, he was held for almost two months as investigators probed two bribery cases against him. But when Chen was formally arrested and transferred into China's criminal law system, the number of cases had ballooned to 38.

"The other 36 cases Chen Qian confessed to on his own during detention," his lawyer said while pleading for leniency, according to court documents. Liu Jianchao, head of the Zhejiang supervision commission, told state media that suspects averaged 42.5 days in detention before being transferred into the criminal justice system. "We place special emphasis on persuading those under investigation to write their own confessions," Liu said.

Who guards the guardians?

Xi's original anti-graft drive brought down party apparatchiks at all levels, from low-level "flies" to highranking "tigers". Previously led by his right-hand man Wang Qishan, who was named vice president on Saturday, critics say the CCDI also served as a weapon to eliminate Xi's adversaries. The new supervision commissions will institutionalise that setup, with the investigative organs written into the constitution as independent bodies overseen by the party-led people's

Rights groups and lawyers warn that it will put the bodies beyond judicial scrutiny, but in China's capital, officials say such independence is necessary to take down powerful officials. Zhang Shuofu, who leads the Beijing commission, said the new bodies were modelled on an ancient system, dispelling concerns by citing "internal and external oversight". That oversight relies on the people's congresses which are technically charged with supervising most of China's bureaucracy, but in practice do little. "Our oversight work has some problems," admitted Zhou Chengkui, a former deputy general secretary of the National People's Congress, in a recent interview with China Law Review. "Namely the people's congress doesn't dare supervise!" —AFP

fomented divisions within the opposition, barred Maduro's two main rivals from standing, brazenly uses state resources in its campaigns, and benefits from a compliant election board.

The board's head, Tibisay Lucena, is on US, EU and Canadian sanctions lists accused of violating democracy. Even its chosen vote machine operator, UK-based Smartmatic, accused her institution of fraud in a vote last year. "Though Falcon is twice as popular as Maduro and could beat him in a competitive race, the 20 May vote will not be competitive," wrote Eurasia consultancy.

In line with his promise of a government of "national unity", Falcon is reaching out to opposition leaders like former presidential candidate Henrique Capriles to relax the boycott and join his campaign. He has picked a Wall Street bank analyst, Francisco Rodriguez, to head his economic team. And in a nod to his former allies in

the ruling "Chavismo" movement and a signal to the armed forces that they need not fear him, Falcon may keep Defense Minister Vladimir Padrino should he win, a campaign aide said.

But to win, Falcon needs to convince voters in places like La Vega, a poor hillside 'barrio' of Caracas that is a traditional 'Chavista' stronghold. At a bread shop there, chatter revolved around impossibly high food prices and the growing migration of Venezuelans to Colombia. There was next to no enthusiasm either for Falcon or Maduro. "I want to vote to change this disaster! But there are no good candidates," said Jose Sanchez, 25, an internet cafe worker whose minimum monthly wage - less than \$2 at the black market rate - does not even cover diapers for his twin babies. "Let's see if Falcon has changed since his Chavista days. I suppose I might vote for him, but only to get rid of Maduro," added Sanchez, who voted for the opposition in recent polls.

'Hunger pummeling us'

Driver Gustavo Isturiz, 56, said he voted for the government in multiple polls since Chavez won office in 1998 but was fed up with rising penury. "Hunger is pummeling our stomachs, but the opposition still has no chance," he said. "I

can't go over to them until a good candidate appears. I don't like Henri Falcon: he has no political project and he's not inspiring hope." Some in La Vega's winding streets said they were so reliant on state handouts they would not dare to vote against Maduro for fear officials would see their ballot and cancel their benefits.

Falcon, whose energy is evident in his daily pre-dawn jogs, plans to start street campaigning in the next few days. He vows to keep popular welfare benefits but also open Venezuela's economy along more business-friendly lines. His adviser Rodriguez recommends dollarizing the economy, seeking \$15-20 billion in annual foreign funding, lowering taxes for oil investors, and dismantling currency controls.

Falcon faces a tough job persuading western nations to withdraw their objections

to the May 20 vote. The United States has been vociferous, threatening to extend sanctions on the Maduro government to hit the oil sector if it goes ahead with what critics are calling a "coronation" on May 20. Its top diplomat in

Venezuela, Todd Robinson, met with Falcon recently, sources close to the candidate said, trying to persuade him to withdraw as his challenge was undermining US efforts to iso-

late Maduro. Washington seems to be calculating that if Maduro scores a Pyrrhic victory, and is left governing a ravaged economy, military and social pres-

sure will become unbearable. "If Maduro wins, as looks likely, it will be a very unstable government," said Caracas-based consultant Dimitris Pantoulas. "At home, he is flirting with a coup d'etat and abroad he will be a pariah." —Reuters

Rebels fanned out across the city, giving victory signs and taking pictures with Turkish tanks parked outside official buildings. The flags of Turkey and Syrian rebel groups were raised in the city and a statue of Kurdish hero Kawa, a symbol of resistance against oppressors, was torn down. Civilians were seen fleeing the city and plumes of smoke rose into the sky as mines exploded.

Around 250,000 civilians had left in recent days after pro-Ankara fighters took the surrounding region and all but encircled the city, fleeing southwards to territory still held by the YPG or controlled by the Syrian regime. President Recep Tayyip Erdogan announced that Turkish-backed fighters had taken control of the city center and said a "large number" of Kurdish fighters had "fled with their tails between their legs".

The Turkish leader has said the operation could move on to other Kurdish-controlled areas of northern Syria. "Our work is not finished.... but terrorism is finished in Afrin," Turkish government spokesman Bekir Bozdag said. Residents said it appeared that YPG units had withdrawn from the city without a fight. But Kurdish authorities vowed to retake Afrin, one of three semiautonomous Kurdish "cantons" in northern Syria. "Resistance... will continue until every inch of Afrin is liberated," authorities representing the Afrin canton said in a statement. "In all of Afrin's sectors, our forces will become a permanent nightmare" for pro-Ankara fighters, the statement said, promising "a switch from direct confrontation to hit-and-run attacks".

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights, a Britainbased war monitor, says more than 280 civilians have been killed since the campaign began on Jan 20. Ankara has denied the reports and said it takes the "utmost

"Sports is empowerment," said Lina Almaeena, a member of the kingdom's advisory Shura Council, and director of Jeddah United, Saudi Arabia's first women's basketball team. "We are not fighting for mixed gender, abaya-less sporting events. Our aim is not to go against our culture. Our goal is mass participation of women in sports." — AFP

care" to avoid civilian casualties. The Observatory said yesterday that more than 1,500 Kurdish fighters had been killed since the start of the offensive, most of them in air strikes and artillery fire.

More than 400 pro-Ankara rebels have also been killed, it said. The Turkish military says 46 Turkish soldiers have died. Turkey sees the YPG as a "terrorist" offshoot of the outlawed Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK), which has waged a decades-long insurgency against the Turkish state. But the Kurdish militia has also formed the backbone of a US-backed alliance that successfully expelled the Islamic State jihadist group from large parts of Syria.

On another front near Damascus, thousands of civilians continued to stream out of Eastern Ghouta for a fourth day as the regime's Russian-backed air and ground assault appeared to have eased up. Regime ghters have retaken more than 80 percent of the former rebel bastion since the offensive was launched on Feb 18, the Observatory says, slicing what remains into three pockets each held by different rebel groups. More than 1,400 civilians have been killed in the offensive and at least 65,000 civilians are reported to have fled the area in recent days.

Observatory head Rami Abdel Rahman said there had not been any air strikes yesterday and only sporadic mortar fire into a southern pocket of the enclave held by the Faylaq al-Rahman rebel group. "The area is awaiting the announcement of a deal between Faylaq al-Rahman and Russia on an evacuation of rebels to northern Syria," Abdel Rahman told AFP.

Assad met with soldiers in Eastern Ghouta yesterday, the presidency said, in the leader's first trip to the region in years. Syria state television broadcast photos of the president dressed in a shirt and jacket surrounded by soldiers, some perched on a tank behind him, in an unspecified part of Eastern Ghouta. Syria's conflict broke out in 2011 with protests against Assad. He has maintained his grip on power despite global calls to step down and outrage at the brutal offensives he has waged to retake towns and cities from rebel fighters. — AFP

UK teacher named world's best, wins \$1 million prize

DUBAI: Briton Andria Zafirakou, who works in a school in one of the UK's poorest areas, yesterday won the \$1 million Global Teacher Prize for 2018 at a star-studded ceremony in Dubai. The arts and textiles teacher from the Alperton Community College of Brent, an inner-city school in London, was among 10 finalists from around the globe for the annual award. Thirty thousand candidates were in the running.

Dubai ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al-Maktoum and British Prime Minister Theresa May were among the first to congratulate her. "Congratulations to Andria Zafirakou for having won the Global Teacher award," tweeted Sheikh Mohammed after handing her the prize. He said teaching "is the greatest job" ever, and described teachers as "stars". May, in a video message broadcast at the gala event, said: "Being a great teacher requires resilience, ingenuity, and a generous heart. These are the qualities that you share with your students every day. So thank you for all you have done and continue to do."

Formula One champion Lewis Hamilton raced to the venue to deliver the trophy while South African comedian Trevor Noah hosted the event which

and Bahrain imposed an economic boycott on Qatar, accusing it of supporting Islamist militants and Iran.
"We believe NBAD has participated in an extraordi-

nary and unlawful scheme to wage financial warfare against Qatar, including through the manipulation of Qatari currency and securities markets," said the letter to the US Treasury dated Feb 26, which has been seen by Reuters. "These actions should be halted immediately, and we ask that you investigate whether NBAD has directly or indirectly supported the manipulation of Qatar's markets, including through NBAD America's dollar-clearing or correspondent banking services in the United States," the letter said.

FAB, which was created from the merger of First Gulf Bank and National Bank of Abu Dhabi last year, did not respond to questions about details of the allegations. "As the UAE's largest bank and one of the world's largest and safest financial institutions, First Abu Dhabi Bank (FAB) works closely with all of its regulators in the markets in which it operates, to sustain and uphold the high standards of governance and regulatory compliance across the group," it said. The UAE government did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

A Qatari government spokesman confirmed the letters had been sent to US regulators but declined to comment on their content. New York-based law firm Paul, Weiss declined to comment. The US Treasury and CFTC did not immediately respond to requests for comment. Qatar's central bank said in December it had launched an investigation into possible manipulation of its markets by the countries that had imposed the economic blockade. Qatar, a small Gulf state and major gas exporter, denies the allegations that it has financed terrorism and says the blockade is an attempt to punish Doha for independent policies.

The UAE and Saudi Arabia have refused to soften their demands - which include Qatar cutting ties with Iran and shutting down state-funded broadcaster Al Jazeera. Qatar, which is also home to the largest US military base in the region, has repeatedly reached out to Washington to mediate in the crisis but the attempts have failed so far. Last week, US President Donald

Trump, who has previously accused Qatar of sponsoring terrorism, sacked US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, who had publicly defended Qatar and pressured Trump to moderate his stance.

Tillerson's sacking came ahead of a new diplomatic push to help mediate the dispute among America's Gulf allies. The United States is due to host a Gulf Cooperation Council summit later this year and before that Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman, Abu Dhabi Crown Prince Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed al Nahyan and Qatari Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al Thani are all due in Washington for separate state visits.

The Qatari central bank has previously accused unnamed banks of trying to manipulate the riyal by trading it between themselves offshore at artificially weak levels - to create an illusion Qatar's economy was crumbling. The rival has been pegged to the US dollar at a rate of 3.64 for more than a decade, but in the initial months of the boycott it traded as low as 3.8950 offshore.

In the letter to the US Treasury, Qatar's lawyers said hey suspected NBAD was driving the riyal lower during illiquid periods, such as Islam's Eid Al-Adha holidays last year, "reinforcing the manufactured narrative that Qatar's currency was increasingly volatile and its economy was too unstable for investment". "NBAD's quotes - and those of other banks involved in the manipulation - were likely all bogus," the letter said without naming the banks and referring to foreign exchange quotes posted by NBAD.

"There is evidence that at the same time NBAD was providing quotes with great frequency and at rates lower than the official rate of 3.64, its traders were unwilling to actually transact at those prices," the letter said. It cited one example on Nov. 22, 2017: when a counterparty reached out to NBAD to execute a deal, it was told by a representative of NBAD that it had no riyal to trade. FAB declined to comment when asked about the specific allegation.

The letter did not name the counterparty but said the central bank's lawyers were ready to provide regulators with a recorded chat between the two sides, on a confidential basis. It said NBAD stopped quoting the rival in December after Qatar vowed to investigate. The central bank also pledged on Nov 23 to satisfy any market demand for dollars and the riyal has since rebounded in offshore transactions to trade close to its peg. Many bankers in the region say that with more than \$300 billion in central bank reserves and sovereign wealth fund assets, Oatar has more than enough financial firepower to block any attack on its currency. — Reuters

Tributes to 'inspiration' Hawking as curtain falls on Paralympics


Paralympic chief closes Pyeongchang Winter Games

PYEONGCHANG: The Pyeongchang Winter at the closing ceremony but North Korea's was brought Paralympics closed yesterday with a dazzling ceremony featuring light shows, dancing and music, as well as tributes to late wheelchair-bound British physicist Stephen Hawking as an "inspiration".

Nine days of sporting action ended earlier in the day with a flurry of events, including victory for the United States in a hard-fought sledge hockey final, helping them to top the medals table with 36 overall. North Korea's athletes, who made their country's Winter Paralympics debut in Pyeongchang, were absent from the closing ceremony after heading home early, but it was a minor sticking point after the rapid inter-Korean thaw of recent weeks.

With thousands packing out the Pyeongchang

Stadium, Olympic International Paralympic Committee president Andrew Parsons used his closing address to pay tribute to Hawking, who died last week aged 76. The scientist is seen as an inspiration by Paralympians. He never let his acute physical disability stop him from pursuing his dreams, and is fondly remembered for



"While Hawking tested the limits of his imagination, Paralympians, you have once again pushed the boundaries of human endeavour," he said. "Your logic-defying performances have focused the world not on what holds you back, but on what motivates you and pushes you forward." Hawking developed a form of motor neurone disease in his 20s that left him confined to a wheelchair, almost completely paralysed and only able to speak through a voice synthesiser.

But his disability did not stop him pursuing his ambition of unlocking the secrets of the Universe, and his best-selling book "A Brief History of Time" made him a household name. In a memorable speech at the opening of the 2012 Games, Hawking urged Paralympians to "look up at the stars and not down at your feet".

Beijing-which will host the 2022 Winter Olympics and Paralympics. In a fitting finale to the Games' high-octane sporting

action, the USA earlier Sunday beat Canada 2-1 with a dramatic goal in overtime to defend their Paralympic sledge hockey title.

It brought Team USA's gold medal haul to 13.

Russian athletes-competing as neutrals after their country was banned due to a doping scandal-picked up eight gold medals, second-highest after the USA and tied with Canada.

The Winter Paralympics broke records for ticket sales, which topped 340,000, as well as for the number of athletes competing at 567. There were numerous tales of triumph over adversity.

Dutch snowboarder Bibian Mentel-Spee won two gold medals despite having had cancer surgery twice in recent months. American skier Oksana Masters-born with multiple birth defects due to the Chernobyl nuclear disaster-also won double gold. — AFP

Park grabs LPGA lead as Davies chases win

LOS ANGELES: South Korea's Park In-bee fired a nine-under par 63 to seize a one-stroke lead after Saturday's third round of the LPGA Founders Cup, where Britain's 54-year-old Laura Davies chased a his-

Park, a seven-time major winner, opened with four birdies and an eagle in the first five holes and vaulted atop the leaderboard at 14-under 202. That was one stroke ahead of Colombia's Mariajo Uribe with Thailand's Ariya Jutanugarn third on 204 at Wildfire Golf Club in Phoenix, Arizona. Davies shot a 63 for the first time since 2005 in jumping into a share of fourth with South Korea's Chella Choi on 205.

The Englishwoman would become the oldest champion in LPGA history by winning Sunday in the first event of the season on US soil. "I'll certainly have a crack at it," Davies said. "I've given myself a chance."

The sizzling start had Park pondering the all-time LPGA record low 18-hole score of 59 fired by Sweden's Annika Sorenstam in 2001. "For a little bit I think a 59. I got off to a really good start," Park said. "On the back nine, it was different, a little

bit more boring golf." But after the fantastic start, Park only birdied the par-4 ninth and par-5 11th until she closed her bogey-free round with a birdie at 18. "To finish with a birdie on the back nine was a big relief," Park said. "The front nine felt great. The back nine I was hitting pretty solid but the putts didn't drop like they did on the front nine. If they did I would've had a 59."

Park, who has won nine times in 15 prior attempts when leading entering the final round, matched Davies for the day's low round. Davies, who has not won since the 2001 Rochester Invitational, would break the oldest LPGA winner mark held by Beth Daniel, who was 46 when she won the 2003 Canadian Women's Open.

Davies, in her 32nd LPGA campaign, birdied five of the last six holes on the front nine, eagled the par-5 11th and birdied the par-5 15th and par-3 17th holes. "I hit a lot of fairways and that gives you a chance to get relatively close to the hole," Davies said.

"I haven't been holing the putts but today I did. The no bogeys part for me is the biggest key because that is what has been letting me down. "I know I can still play great golf. My short game is really coming around and a day like this tells me that we are really doing the right things." Davies is struggling to walk with a sore left calf and Achilles

"It's a struggle," she said. "It's just walking. Swinging is fine. I can swing as hard as I want to. But every step is just misery." — AFP

Hamilton not close to 'final chapter'

LONDON: Lewis Hamilton has vowed to reign supreme in Formula One for years to come as the world champion prepares for the start of the new season next weekend. British star Hamilton is reportedly ready to sign a new contract with Mercedes, which could earn him up to \$40 million (\$55 million) per year and solidify his position as

British sport's highest earner.

That would be the ideal preparation for the season opener in Melbourne as Hamilton eyes a fifth world championship. Along with Michael Schumacher and Juan Manuel Fangio, he would be only the third F1 driver to have won the title more than four times.

Even that historic feat wouldn't be enough for Hamilton to walk away from the sport however. "It doesn't feel like the start of the final chapter, and I don't feel as though I am about to embark on my last contract," Hamilton said.

"I am not sure how I will feel in two or three years' time but I am back here in March for my 12th season and I am so excited. "I don't know where it comes from - this feeling of just wanting to excel but I really, really, more than anything currently in my life, want to excel next weekend.

"I want to arrive in Melbourne fit. I want to hit my target weight. I want to kill it through practice, get pole position and I want to win the race convincingly. "I don't know how long this feeling is going to last when I go into a new season, but as long as I am still feeling like this I will keep going."

Hamilton won last year's championship with two races to spare. But he kept a low profile over the winter following criticism he received for comments he made in an Instagram video about his young nephew wearing a princess dress.

Hamilton embarked on a mass deleting spree across both his Instagram and Twitter accounts of which he has a combined 12 million followers - in the wake of the backlash. "Everyone has an opinion about everything," Hamilton said. "The world is moving drastically and no-one is perfect.

We have a pie chart of our brand, what it means and we are constantly evolving that. "I am working with my team to figure out how we get our message across of where we have come from. "For example, what we have done as a working-class family is very different to a story of another racing driver." — AFP

But they couldn't stop the losing streak. Jones, who has made no secret of wanting to win next year's World Cup with England, said it was better the setbacks happened now than at Japan 2019.

'Ît is, unfortunately, something that you have to have because you never find out about yourself unless you have these runs," he told reporters. "Every team I have had that has been a champion team has had these runs which have been instrumental in how you remake a team," added Jones, Australia's coach when they lost the 2003 World Cup final to England. The former Wallaby and Japan boss was appointed to his current post after tournament hosts England suffered the embarrassment of a first-round exit at the 2015 World Cup. England then set off on a winning run that only ended when Ireland denied them a Grand Slam in Dublin last year.

Until last month, that was the only blot on Jones's England record, which now stands at 24 wins from 27 Tests with three defeats.

"When you take over it is reasonably easy, like I did with England, it is quite easy to improve them quickly because you get fix

certain things that need fixing quickly," he said. "But internal mechanisms take time to fix and that is the slow burner. Unless you fix them they catch up with you when you get to the big tournaments such as the World Cup.
"So for us it has been an enormously bene-

ficial tournament if disappointing because we are finding out about how to be a better team." Three converted tries from Garry Ringrose, CJ Stander and Jacob Stockdale put Ireland 21-5 up at the break and on the verge of a St Patrick's Day triumph.

Ireland scrum-half Conor Murray added a penalty and while England's Elliot Daly scored an unconverted try in each half, with fellow wing Jonny May crossed in stoppage time, the visitors never looked like losing their grip in front of a capacity Twickenham crowd of more than 82,000.

England were without injured powerhouse No 8 Billy Vunipola for the entire Six Nations and fellow back-row forwards Nathan Hughes, Courtney Lawes, Sam Underhill and Tom Curry were missing from the Ireland match.

'We're playing without five top back-rowers and other injuries," said Jones. "We have to get a greater depth to our squad that can play Test rugby." Jones praised Ireland by saying: "They played exceptionally well and we just weren't good enough. They play to their strengths, with good resolve and are an excellent team." — AFP

Federer survives scare to face **Del Potro** in final

INDIAN WELLS: World No. 1 Roger Federer extended his season win streak to 17 matches, booking his spot in the Indian Wells Masters final by rallying past Borna Coric 5-7, 6-4, 6-4 on Saturday. The Swiss superstar survived a stern test from world number 49 Coric but managed to hold on for a 17-0 record this year, surpassing his prior career-best calendar year start in 2006 when he opened with 16 wins. "It took a while to get the record," Federer said. "But I'm happy. It was just a fighting match It didn't come easy, so I had to go get it. "I got a little bit lucky. I hung tough and put a lot of effort into it to

"The focus has to be the finals right now. But it's nice to get off to a good start this year, and I hope I can play well again tomorrow." The defending champion will be aiming for a record sixth Indian Wells title when he squares off against world number eight Juan Martin Del Potro in Sunday's championship match. The 36-year-old Federer said he had to draw on every ounce of experience and mental toughness to pull out the match. "Margins are slim at the top of the game," he said. "And I have been there so many times.

"You just hope to take the right decisions along the way, and then it ends up falling your way. "But for that you need to have a very positive mindset. You need to be match-tough, you need to be confident, have experience, and I think I have a bit of all of that right now."

Down a set and trailing 4-2 in the second, Federer had to claw his way back from the brink of defeat. In the third set he fell behind again 4-3 but won the final 11 points of the match to claim the victory. Federer clinched the match when Coric hit a shot wide. The ball was called out but Coric challenged and after the video review the original call was confirmed.

"Borna was incredibly steady," Federer said. "Those 10 minutes when I was down a set and a break it was hard for me to accept. "I got a bit lucky. It was a good match." Federer had not dropped a set (8-0) entering the semifinal. But he looked out of sorts in the opening set Saturday as Croatia's Coric took it handily. The match was played under difficult conditions with winds swirling around the main stadium. Federer said he had to be conservative with his shotmaking to get back in it.

"At some point you are happy with very little," Federer said. Former US Open winner Del Potro improved to 16-3 on the season as he stormed past the hard-serving Canadian Milos Raonic 6-2, 6-3 in just 65 minutes.

'EASIER THAN EXPECTED'

Del Potro is looking for his 22nd career and second straight ATP title in a row after winning earlier this month in Acapulco where he beat three top eight players in a row. "I broke his serve quick in both sets and that gave me control of the match," said Del Potro. "It was an easier match than I expected." Federer is 18-6 lifetime against Del Potro, having rallied to win the last two contests in three sets, including a 6-7 (5/7), 6-4, 6-3 victory in the championship game last year in Federer's hometown of Basel. Federer said he is expecting another gruelling war of attrition with the Argentinian.

'We have had a lot of close matches. Big matches, close matches," he said. "Jeez, I just tried to think back at the French Open semis, US Open finals, Olympic semis, Basel finals. Just threesetters, five-setters the whole way," said Federer. Del Potro said he will be the underdog against Federer.

"He's the favorite to win tomorrow," Del Potro said. "But I beat him in the past, and I know I can repeat that. But it is not easy." — AFP

Jones insists beaten England can bounce back by World Cup

TWICKENHAM: Eddie Jones said England's losing streak was a necessary part of their development ahead of the World Cup after a third straight defeat saw Ireland clich a Grand Slam at Twickenham on Saturday.

Already assured of the Six Nations title, Ireland stormed to just their third Championship clean sweep of all time with a 24-15 victory. Ireland kicked off having both deposed England as Six Nations champions and in second place in the global rankings behind world champions New Zealand.

England, the Six Nations kings in both 2016 and 2017, could have regained second spot with a victory but instead suffered a third succesive defeat following away losses to Scotland and France as they were beaten at Twickenham for the first time under Australian coach Jones.

And with Wales edging France 14-13 later Saturday, it meant England ended the Championship in a lowly fifth place-their shake-up of his reign as England coach.

COLOMBO: India survived late drama in a pulsating final to clinch the Twenty20 tri-series after Dinesh Karthik smashed the final ball for a six to secure their thrilling four-wicket victory against a gallant Bangladesh side yesterday.

With India needing 34 runs off the last two overs, Karthik hammered 29 not out off just eight deliveries, his third six sealing India's third, and the most hardearned, victory over Bangladesh in the tournament.

Put into bat, Bangladesh made 166-8, a total they owe largely to number three batsman Sabbir Rahman who made 77 after their top order collapsed. Chasing



167 to win, India lost openers Shikhar Dhawan and number three Suresh Raina early but skipper Rohit Sharma batted comfortably to score 56 and keep India's chase on track.

He and KL Rahul (24) found it easy going against the Bangladesh bowlers until Sharma went for a fatal slogsweep of Nazmul Islam, departing with three sixes and four boundaries to his name. Mustafizur Rahman then bowled a masterly 18th over, when his first five balls at Vijay Shankar yielded only one run and Manish Pandey (28) perished off the sixth trying to accelerate the con-

'No personality, no class' as Mourinho blasts Man Utd

MANCHESTER: Jose Mourinho launched an astonishing verbal tirade against his Manchester United players after they reached the FA Cup semifinals, accusing them of "a lack of personality, lack of class and lack of desire."

Just 24 hours after the United manager had made a memorable defence of his own record in the pre-match press conference, Mourinho turned his attention to his players after a comfortable 2-0 quarter-final victory over Brighton. Only Nemanja Matic, who set up the opening goal for Romelu Lukaku before scoring a late second himself, and youngster Scott McTominay were spared massive criticism. And after Mourinho claimed he was looking for a response to the midweek Champions League exit to Sevilla, the Portuguese veteran even claimed some of his players lacked the personality and desire to play for the famous Premier League club.

"I didn't like the game," said Mourinho. "I think we deserved to win but I didn't have the reaction from all of them. "I had the reaction from some of them. Some of them were mentally strong enough with the football quality to playthat was the reason we won. "But a team of 11, when you have a minimum of six or

play, who want the responsibility to have the ball, who have the desire really to play-it is difficult to have a good performance "So I am not happy with the performance all all. But I am happy with

England full-back Luke Shaw was the one player named by Mourinho as having failed to follow his game plan and was, accordingly, substituted at half-time. That made Shaw an obvious target for Mourinho to be questioned about although the United manager clearly had other players in mind when issuing his widespread critique. "I wanted more personality in the team because many, many times I felt that Matic was an island of personality, desire and control surrounded by lack of personality, lack of class and lack of desire.

"I have to say that for example McTominay lost more passes today in all the matches he played put together but he was a Manchester United player. "And for me a Manchester United player is one who when he plays badly still gives to the team. That is a question of personality, that is a Manchester United player for me. And that is what some of the others did not have." Mourinho had hinted before the game that many of his stars are currently under-performing and, tellingly, Paul Pogba and Alexis Sanchez were both left out of his starting line-up.

'SCARED TO PLAY'

But the United manager's response to what was, after all, a comfortable victory was an astonishing psychological tactic that may, ultimately, backfire-a point that Mourinho accepted when asked why he had made such a calculated outburst.

"My calculation is that without pressure, they don't perform well. What can I lose?" he said. "And the ones that are always there are the ones that will always be there. And that is an example

'You have the kid that didn't play well at all (McTominay). I told him already, he was the first one I spoke to individually in the dressing room. "And instead of being critical with him, I was positive with him because 'You played very bad but you did the basic things that one player has to do.' "The basic things is to keep the emotional balance to play with that red shirt, which is a heavy shirt to wear. And the kid, in his worst performance by far, he was there and he had body to wear that shirt. "He was not afraid to play. He played bad, and every player can play bad. "But to feel not comfortable to play - 'Please Mister, take me from the pitch.' I felt that."

Mourinho, whose only hope of a trophy this season is the FA Cup, warmed to his theme. He said that some of his big name stars are simply scared of the job in hand at Old Trafford. "A few of the guys, I saw them scared to play. You know when the sun is shining-and in football the sun is shining when everything goes well, you win matches, you score goals, everything goes in your direction-every player is a good player and every player wants to play and every player wants the ball and every player is confident to play and every player looks amazing.

"When it is dark and cold, and that in football means a period of bad results or a bad result like what happened to us a couple of days ago, not everybody has the confidence and the personality to play really." — AFP

Salah can pass Messi and be best in world, insists Klopp

LIVERPOOL: Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp believes comparisons between Mohamed Salah and Barcelona's five-time Ballon d'Or winner Lionel Messi are premature, but that the Egyptian is on his way to one day becoming the best player in the world.

Salah's stunning season continued with a four-goal haul in a 5-0 thrashing of Watford at Anfield to take his tally for the season to 36 on Saturday-the most goals ever scored by a Liverpool player in their debut year at the club.


Messi showed why he is still widely considered the world's best by scoring his 100th Champions League goal in tearing Chelsea apart in a 3-0 win on Wednesday. But Klopp believes Salah, 25, has time on his side to succeed Messi and Real Madrid rival Cristiano Ronaldo, both now in their thirties, as the world's best player. "I think Mo is on the way (to being the best in the world)," said Klopp. "I don't think Mo or anybody else wants to be compared with Lionel Messi. He is the one who is doing what he's doing for what feels like 20 years or so.'

And Klopp challenged Salah to maintain the standards he has set this season in the manner Messi and Ronaldo have for the past decade. "As it always is in life, if you have the skills, you have to show that constantly, and consistently he is very good and he helps us a lot." Salah even defied the slippery conditions of a snow storm as he weaved his way past Jose Holebas to slot home the opener after just four minutes.

'Conditions were difficult. It was obviously slippery and everybody suffered, but not Mo in that situation. It was really special," added Klopp. Liverpool had to wait until two minutes before half-time to double their advantage, but there was no surprise who was on the end of a sweeping team move as Salah got his second of the evening from Andy Robertson's



Pedro halts slide, sends Chelsea into FA Cup semi-finals

LEICESTER: Pedro Rodriguez came off the bench to halt Chelsea's slide with an extra-time winner in a 2-1 victory at Leicester yesterday to reach the FA Cup semi-finals. Alvaro Morata's first goal since Boxing Day on his return to the Chelsea starting line-up put the visitors on course to bounce back from their Champions League elimination at the hands of Barcelona in midweek.

However, Jamie Vardy's equaliser 15 minutes from time made them do it the hard way in an extra 30 minutes. Yet, for all Antonio Conte's complaints this season about his side's strength in depth, the Italian was able to call on Pedro to turn the game in Chelsea's favour when he headed home former Leicester favourite N'Golo Kante's cross.

Barca lead the standings on 75 points, 11 ahead of nearest challengers Atletico Madrid who were visiting Villarreal later on Sunday, with champions Real Madrid hosting Girona. The Catalans were missing injured midfield linchpin Sergio Busquets as well as Suarez. However, they were rampant in the first half and could have taken a heavier lead into the break as Brazilian midfielder Philippe Coutinho hit the woodwork twice and his compatriot Paulinho struck a post.

The unbeaten league leaders slowed down in the second half and Athletic came into the game for the first time but despite numerous forays into Barca's

area they rarely got close to troubling goalkeeper Marc-Andre ter Stegen.

Earlier yesterday Sevilla suffered a hangover from their Champions League triumph over Manchester United as they lost 2-1 at mid-table Leganes in La Liga yesterday, their sixth defeat in 12 league games under coach Vincenzo Montella. Sevilla qualified for the quarter-finals of Europe's elite competition for the first time by beating United 2-1 at Old Trafford on Tuesday but went behind to Leganes four minutes before halftime to a looping header from defender Unai Bustinza.

Montella made three changes from the side that

had stunned Old Trafford, giving a starting berth to Wissam Ben Yedder after he scored twice after coming off the bench on Tuesday, but his side rarely got

going against Leganes. Forward Javier Eraso side-footed home a second goal for the home side in the 69th minute and things got worse for Sevilla when midfielder Pablo Sarabia was sent off in the 84th for picking up two yellow cards inside 11 minutes.

Miguel Layun pulled a goal back for Sevilla in the 90th minute. Sevilla are fifth in the Liga standings on 45 points, 12 behind fourth-placed Real Madrid and one ahead of Villarreal in sixth. — Reuters

Chelsea had lost three of their past four matches to fall behind in the race for a top-four finish in the Premier League as well as their European exit. But victory does at least keep their chances of silverware to end the season alive. Chelsea will meet Southampton in the last four, while Manchester United face Tottenham Hotspur for a place in the final. Both Morata and Pedro had a point to prove after being left out of the Spain squad on Friday just three

months ahead of the World Cup. Morata was recalled for just his second start since the sides last met in a 0-0 draw at Stamford Bridge back in January. And after a quiet start, Chelsea's club record \$70 million buy from Real Madrid was presented with his first big chance of the afternoon when he was brilliantly picked out by Marcos Alonso's low cross, but his shot was far too close to Kasper Schmeichel.

Morata headed another half-chance from a teasing Willian cross over and then hit the outside of the post from the narrowest of angles. The goal he craved finally arrived three minutes before half-time, but much of the credit must go to Willian who surged through the heart of the Leicester midfield on the counter-attack before feeding

Morata. And Morata coolly clipped the ball beyond the advancing Schmeichel with an assuredness unbefitting of a striker who had gone 13 games without a goal. Despite going in front, Conte still withdrew Tiemoue Bakayoko at half-time after another awful 45 minutes for the Frenchman in a desperately disappointing debut season in English football following a £40 million move from Monaco.

The visitors were happy to take their chances on the counter-attack in the second period as they began to feel the after-effects of their run around at Barcelona in midweek. Leicester's search for an equaliser was largely laboured and, even when a big chance did arise, Vardy headed wastefully over when completely unmarked inside the area. However, the England international made amends 15 minutes from time when he forced the ball home at the third attempt after Vicente Iborra's first two efforts were blocked and then saved by Willy Caballero. Only a fine low save from Caballero prevented Vardy from turning the tie completely around eight minutes later as both sides settled for extra time. Crucially, Conte was able to refresh his side as Pedro, Gary Cahill and Olivier Giroud were all introduced in the first half of extra time.—AFP

ASEAN, Australia slam trade protectionism

Summit says multi-nation trade key to prosperity

SYDNEY: The leaders of Australia and Singapore closed a regional summit yesterday with a stand against protectionism, arguing in favor of multi-nation trade deals as fears mount that US plans for new tariffs could stoke a global trade war.

"We strongly believe that a free, open and rules-based multilateral trading system is key to the region's growth and prosperity," Singapore's Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong said at a news conference to mark the end of a summit between Australia and the Association of Southeast Asian

Nations (ASEAN). President Donald Trump announced the tariffs on March 7 to protect domestic steel and aluminum producers on national security grounds. The United States is also looking at tariffs on up to \$60 billion worth of Chinese imports, targeting technology and telecommunications sectors. Lee and Turnbull urged ASEAN to speedily agree to the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership, a Chinabacked alternative to the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) trade pact that Trump withdrew the United States from last year. "If we secure a good agreement, this would be, as one of our colleagues said this morning, an antithesis of protectionism, it would ensure, on the back of the TPP-11, that the Indo-Pacific continues to be the fulcrum of open and free trade," Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull said.

Officially, the summit was focused on fostering closer economic ties among the members of ASEAN and Australia, and countering the threat of Islamist militants returning to the region from the Middle East. Australia hosted the weekend meetings despite not being a member of the 10nation bloc, aiming to tighten political and trade

ties in the region amid China's rising influence. In a joint communique issued at the conclusion of the summit, ASEAN and Australia also called for "self-restraint" in the South China Sea, where aggressive Chinese expansion has irked ASEAN members. "We emphasize the importance of non-militarization and the need to enhance mutual trust and confidence, exercise self-restraint...and avoid actions that may com-

plicate the situation," the communique said. ASEAN members Brunei, Malaysia, Vietnam, the Philippines, also have claims in the important trade waterway that is mostly claimed by China, which has been building artificial islands on reefs, some with ports and air strips.

"This is a security and stability question in Southeast Asia which will affect all ASEAN countries if it goes wrong," Lee said. ASEAN also called for the "complete, verifiable and irreversible denuclearisation of the Korean Peninsula" and urged all UN members to strictly apply Security-Council sanctions on North Korea. — Reuters

US crude exports becoming bigger presence in global oil

NEW YORK: Boosted by surging output, the to build a refinery, you cannot just switch." United States is becoming a significant exporter of crude oil, a shift that is remaking American infrastructure and altering the global petroleum market.

Now pumping more than 10 million barrels per day, the US has become the second biggest oil producer in the world behind Russia and ahead of Saudi Arabia. The bounty is the result of the shale oil boom due to new drilling and production techniques.

Eyeing this jump, the US at the end of 2015 scrapped its embargo on exports, a policy in place since the 1970s oil shocks. Energy companies have seized on the opening, exporting 1.1 million barrels per day to 37 countries in 2017. Canada is the leading destination of American crude, but the US has also been exporting more to Asia, long a major market for the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and Russia.

China is the second biggest market for US exports, data shows. Over the last decade, US crude imports have fallen from 10 million barrels a day to eight million barrels a day.

But the US remains a major importer of crude oil, in large part because American oil refineries are not designed for the lighterweight crude that comes out of shale fields. Rather, many plants are built to run on heavier oils from Canada, Mexico or Venezuela that are cheaper to procure and result in lofty profit margins after they are processed into gasoline. "The choice was made to invest in a more expensive, more sophisticated refinery that is a lot more costly to run, with the view that you are getting crude oil to a discount," said Harry Tchilinguirian, senior oil market strategist at BNP Paribas global markets. "Considering that it takes five to seven years

Rethinking infrastructure

Prior to the shale boom, which dates to 2010 or 2011, the US had been planning new pipeline capacity to allow greater crude imports from Canada. But the shift in the US oil production picture has also altered the outlook for energy infrastructure. US companies are now focusing on adding domestic pipelines and export terminals in the Gulf Coast region to ship American oil abroad.

"The US cannot become completely independent of foreign oil," Tchilinguirian said.

In this context, President Donald Trump's idea of "energy dominance" or "the golden era of American energy" means not only reducing the role of imports, but "also being able to actively capture market share abroad,' he said. Perhaps the most emblematic project is the reinvention of the Louisiana Offshore Oil Port, the only terminal in the US capable of servicing supertankers.

The facility was used for oil exports instead of imports for the first time in February. Farther west, the port of Corpus Christi, Texas is expected to become a bigger venue for crude exports and plans a \$327 million project to widen and deepen the port's channel. Experts think US oil exports could grow to as much as four to five million barrels a day in the medium term, prompting questions on which markets will buy the additional oil. In the near-term, John Coleman of consultancy Wood Mackenzie expects much of the crude to reach Europe, given the compatibility of the oil with the continent's refineries. But beyond 2022, the outlook is cloudier, in part because of new refineries coming on line in Africa and the Middle East, thus limiting their exports. — AFP

Abu Dhabi awards France's Total stakes in oil concessions

ABU DHABI: Abu Dhabi state energy company ADNOC said vesterday it had awarded French oil giant Total stakes in two offshore oil concessions, as it looks to boost production by year's end. Total now holds a fifth of the Umm Shaif and Nasr concession and 5 percent of the Lower Zakum concession, together worth some 5.3 billion dirhams (\$1.4 billion, 1.2

million euros), ADNOC said in a press release. Both concessions are effective March 9 for a duration of 40 years and are operated by ADNOC Offshore, a subsidiary of ADNOC, according to the statement. Sunday's signing was hosted by the Louvre Abu Dhabi, the billion-euro French-Emirati project that is the first Louvre-branded museum outside of France.

Nearly 6 in 10 Kuwait job-seekers hope to find ideal job in 6 months

88% in Kuwait expect their career growth opportunities to improve

KUWAIT: The Bayt.com 'Jobseeker Confidence Survey,' revealed that over two thirds (67 percent) of job seekers who provided an answer expect business conditions in Kuwait to 'improve' in a year's time. When it came to current business conditions in Kuwait, only 18 percent of job seekers thought they are below average.

Job seekers have largely positive perceptions of future economic conditions. According to the survey, close to two thirds (63.1 percent) of Kuwait job seekers who responded to this question said they expect their country's economy to 'improve' within the next six months, 23.7 percent said they expect it to 'remain the same', and only 13.2 percent think it could 'get worse'.

In regards to availability of jobs in Kuwait, nearly six in 10 (57 percent) job seekers are either 'somewhat hopeful' or 'very hopeful' that they will find their ideal job in the next six months. What's more, close to half of those who answered the question (45 percent) believe the number of jobs available in Kuwait will increase in the next six months, one third (33 percent) believe it will remain the same, and only 22 percent believe it could decrease.

The survey, administered by Bayt.com, the Middle East's #1 job site, and YouGov, global online market research company, aims to gauge perceptions and attitudes of job seekers regarding the job hunt. The positive findings of this year's job seeker confidence index are also echoed in the Bayt.com Middle East Job Index, which showed that nearly nine in 10 companies across the MENA region will be hiring over the next 12 months.

Expectations

Even at the personal level, the great majority (92 percent) of job seekers in Kuwait who provided an answer said they expect their personal financial position to 'improve' or at least 'remain the same' in the next six months.

Likewise, 88 percent of job seekers who responded to the survey question on career growth said they expect their career growth opportunities to either improve or maintain the same level in the next six months. Currently, three quarters (75 percent) of Kuwait respondents are either 'satisfied' or neutral towards their career growth opportunities.



Average monthly crude prices dropped for first time in 8 months

KUWAIT: Oil prices remained under pressure over the last month following concerns relating to shale oversupply that hit another record high of 10.38 mb/d as shale drillers continue to pump record crude to take advantage of elevated oil prices as compared to last year's levels. As a result, production rate in the US is up almost 10 percent since January-18 adding almost 1 mb/d in additional production. Commercial crude inventories in the US was also up for the third consecutive week to reach 430.93 million barrels, a level last seen in December-17. However, a larger-than-expected drop in refined product inventories partially offset the impact of the inventory build.

Pressure on crude prices also came from new tariff plans that are soon to be imposed by the US on steel and aluminum imports. This has triggered expectations of a global trade war with similar reactions from other countries with countermeasures that could threaten oil demand, especially in the maritime sector and the trucking industry. Furthermore, an elevated dollar since mid-February also capped an upward movement in crude oil prices. In addition, the recent pickup in economic growth in China, one of the key drivers of global oil demand, provided intermittent support to crude prices. The country recorded higher refinery runs during the first two months of the year while crude output declined by almost 2 percent year-on-year, resulting in higher demand for crude.

On the demand side, gasoline demand in the US rose to a seven-month high level, according to EIA, despite higher refinery runs at a time when they are normally down for maintenance. As a consequence, total gasoline stocks in the US declined by 6.3 million barrels, a much larger decline as compared to the 4.4 million barrel decline in distillate inventories. Overall, refined product inventory was down by 3.4 million barrels to the lowest level since October-14. IEA, in its monthly report, said that oil demand is expected to pickup this year, but the agency also acknowledged that output

growth would be much faster. The agency raised its oil demand forecast for 2018 to 99.3 mb/d from 97.8 mb/d in its previous forecast, an upward revision of 1.5 mb/d.

In terms of production, OPEC continued to curb output during February-18 and produced at 32.28 mb/d, the lowest level over the past 10 months, according to Bloomberg data. Saudi Arabia reported the biggest drop in production, while the ongoing political issues in Venezuela further added to the decline. In its monthly report, OPEC acknowledged the rise in non-OPEC supply and said output would grow at a faster pace vs. demand, also indicating a continued disciplined approach to oil production, beyond the current deadline. This reinforces our view that oil prices would remain range bound in the near term as the positive impact of demand growth would be offset by higher shale output that would be backed by an expected growth in capex by US drillers, in addition to plans of raising output within the OPEC.

Oil prices

The gradual recovery in oil prices over the past one year was dented in February-18 when average monthly crude prices dropped for the first time since June-17. Average OPEC crude price dropped 5.0 percent in February-18 to reach \$ 63.5/b as compared to \$ 66.9/b for the previous month. Kuwait crude also declined by 5.5 percent to \$ 62.1/b while Brent spot witnessed the biggest drop of 5.7 percent to reach an average price of \$ 65.2/b during the month. Initial price trends in March-18 continued to remain weak with Brent crude prices reaching as low as \$ 63.9/b on the back of oversupply concerns.

According to IEA's monthly report, OECD demand growth was upbeat and is expected to increase by 240 tb/d in 2018; however, non-OECD demand expectation were lowered by 150 tb/d due to a switch to natural gas for power generation in Pakistan and Iraq. Speaking at a conference, IEA's Fatih Birol said that the recent surge in oil output from non-OPEC producers including US, Canada and Brazil would be enough to cover all growth in global oil demand until 2020. He also highlighted that the productivity of mature oilfields are dropping at a slowerthan-expected pace that extends oil output from these oilfields. Nevertheless, he also said that for the longer term, oil producers are not investing enough to maintain future production that could result in US shale output peaking by 025 that could result in oil importers going back to Middle East supply.

Meanwhile, US oil rig count dropped for the first time in

seven weeks to 796 rigs for the week ended 9-March-18, according to data from Baker Hughes, although it went up again in the following week by four to reach 800 oil rigs. The monthly international rig count data from Baker Hughes for February-18 showed an increase of 19 rigs for the non-North America region while it increased by a strong 77 rigs in North America resulting in a total increase of 96 rigs. On the international front, Middle East drillers added the highest number of rigs during the month recorded at 13 followed by Africa that added 10 rigs, that more than offset a drop of 12 rigs in the Asia Pacific region.

World oil demand

World oil demand growth estimates for 2017 was revised upwards by 23 tb/d in OPEC's latest monthly oil report. The growth is now expected to have reached 1.62 mb/d to 97.04 mb/d reflecting changes in demand numbers for OECD Asia Pacific and China. In the OECD Asia Pacific region, better-than-expected demand was reported in Japan and Australia during Q4-17 that resulted in an upward adjustment for the quarter. However, December-17 demand was soft for the US, Canada, and South Korea, while Australia recorded a solid growth. On the non-OECD side, Q4-17 demand from China was revised up by 70 tb/d reflecting better-than-expected demand in the petrochemical and transportation sectors. Demand was raised for the other Asia region by 30 tb/d for Q4-17, reflecting higher demand in

India, Indonesia and Thailand. Global oil demand growth expectations for 2018 was also revised up marginally to 1.6 mb/d to a total demand of 98.63 mb/d reflecting higher demand from the Other Asia region, primarily in China and India, and OECD Americas region. Oil demand data from the latter was strong during Q1-18 that led to an upward revision of 20 tb/d. A similar revision was done in oil demand growth from non-OECD region reflecting strong growth in India during January-18. Oil demand data from the US showed robust growth during Q4-17, especially during October-17 and November-17, on the back of transportation and petrochemical sectors further supported by colder weather conditions. However, gasoline requirements in the US declined during December-17 despite higher mileage primarily owing to improving efficiencies as well as increasing retail price of fuel and slight decline in auto sales. Preliminary data for January-18 and February-18 showed strong demand for all product categories supported by the faster economic growth in the US. OECD Europe demand data showed weak trends for January-18 for Germany, France, Italy and the UK due to warmer weather conditions. In the non-OECD region, China continued to see strong oil demand across all fuel categories in January-18 resulting in a growth of 0.61 mb/d. The low baseline effect also contributed to a strong growth of 10.3 percent y-o-y in oil demand in India during January-18 led by strong growth in diesel and gasoline requirements.

World oil supply

Global oil supply continued to rise during February-18 recording a growth of 0.37 mb/d and averaged at 98.2 mb/d, showing an increase of 1.66 mb/d as compared to January-18. Non-OPEC supply during the month accounted for the bulk of this increase at 0.45 mb/d and averaged at 66.01 mb/d (including OPEC NGLs). This growth came primarily on the back of 0.48 mb/d increase in supply from OECD Americas. OPEC oil production witnessed a marginal decline during the month, partially offsetting the growth by non-OPEC producers. For the full year 2017, non-OPEC oil supply estimate was marginally revised upward by 0.01 mb/d to average at 57.87 mb/d resulting in a growth of 0.87 mb/d. The revision primarily reflects higher-than-expected output in Q4-17 with an increase of 63 tb/d due to updated production data mainly from Canada. Non-OPEC supply growth projections for 2018 witnessed another significant upgrade of 0.28 mb/d to a growth of 1.66 mb/d to average

The upward revision primarily reflects higher oil output during Q1-18 by 360 tb/d in OECD Americas and OECD Europe, FSU, China, Norway, Brunei and Egypt partially offset by downward revisions to supply from Australia, India, Indonesia, other Asia, Argentina, Colombia and Azerbaijan. Supply projections from the US saw the biggest revision of 0.16 mb/d followed by China (0.05 mb/d), Canada (0.04 mb/d), and Brazil (0.03 mb/d). Canada is expected to see higher production from the new main oil sand projects that would increase the country's production by 0.27 mb/d as compared to 2017, while in Brazil, new field startups in Q4-18 is expected to result in an annual growth of 0.23 mb/d.

OPEC oil production & spare capacity

OPEC production during February-18 reached the lowest level in the past ten months with a marginal decline of 80 tb/d or 0.2 percent to record an average production rate of 32.28 mb/d, according to data from Bloomberg. OPEC's secondary sources also pointed to a similar decline, although the individual country contribution to the decline was different. According to Bloomberg, Saudi Arabia reduced production by 80 tb/d followed by UAE (-50 tb/d), Venezuela (-30 tb/d) and Angola (-20 tb/d). These declines were partially offset by higher production in Libya (+70 tb/d) followed by Qatar and Algeria that increased production by 20 tb/d each. The decline in OPEC production was also reflected in its compliance levels to the ongoing production levels. According to Bloomberg calculations, compliance levels reached 147 percent during February-18 as compared to 137 percent for January-18.

Libya, which is exempt from the production cuts, recorded the biggest jump in oil production that reached 1.05 mb/d in February-18. The country's focus on the oil sector is critical for state finances and has resulted in Libya expanding its exports to Europe and America despite intermittent disruption and strikes at key oilfields and ports.

Meanwhile, Venezuela continues to suffer from political and economic instability that resulted in its production reaching the lowest monthly average level in 15 years. IEA forecasted that in the next six years, Venezuela's oil production capacity will reach the lowest level since the 1940s. On the other hand, Angola has also reported declining production for the second consecutive month, with output reaching the lowest level since October-16. Lack of foreign investments in the country's oil sector coupled with aging oilfields has resulted in the decline in production in Angola. In terms of OPEC production, there were indications that the ongoing production cut agreement will go beyond the current deadline although the form of the pact may be modified to accommodate the long term additional output capacity being added by OPEC members. These include Iraq's plans to raise output capacity to 7 mb/d by 2022, plans to add 30 active rigs by Kuwait by year end, in addition to a number of ongoing projects in the oil sector across the region.

Hot US politics dictates market trajectory; rate hike on horizon

KUWAIT: Recent inflationary figures out of the US were not too hot, neither too cold, but just enough to fortify the outlook for three interest rate hikes this year by the Federal Reserve. The inflation data from the US last week strengthened market sentiment temporarily, with S&P 500 futures rising and bond yields dipping. The inflation report was neutral enough that it was swiftly dominated by political turbulence in Washington when President Donald Trump fired Secretary of State Rex Tillerson. US stock markets immediately reversed gains. The absence of a major upward surprise in the inflation numbers may assist equity and bond markets to find some calmness after markets were shaken by January's labor report which showed wages rose much faster than anticipated. With inflationary fears out of the way US political turmoil continues to overshadow the goldilocks era in America, which the equity

Looking back at the dollar's trajectory, the green back continued to maneuver in greater response to political issues than economic fundamentals. The continuous shift in crucial employees at the White House is elevating concerns that the current administration could pursue an even more aggressive and protectionist policy agenda moving forward. Donald Trump's top economic adviser Gary Cohn resigned following Trump's pronouncement to enforce tariffs on steel and aluminum imports, a move Cohn and the treasury secretary have strongly opposed. Moreover, Reuters reported that President Trump is pursuing to impose tariffs of up to \$60 billion on Chinese imports and will target the technology and communication sectors. Politico reported that US Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer offered Trump a package of tariffs targeting \$30 billion a year on Chinese imports. However, the president insisted on a greater number. It is not a surprise that investors are demanding a greater risk premium for dollar investments.

As for the ECB's president, who cited last week that the present monetary strategy will remain cautiously loose despite increased confidence on the future path of inflation, therefore further upside price growth data is needed. The conclusion from the remarks of Draghi and Chief Economist at the ECB was that additional inflationary signs are desired before policy setters press the brakes on the loose monetary approach. Policy rates will need to persist at their present altitudes well past the end of net asset purchases until then. Thus, the first interest rate rise is not expected until around the middle of 2019.

Since the start of the year, currencies around the globe haven't hesitated to take advantage of the Dollar's weakness. Draghi stressed on the issue by stating the Bank remained alarmed about the strength of the euro that is not fully backed up by improving economic fundamentals in the euro-zone but more by external factors according to the ECB's analysis. External factors such heightened political instability in the US have been more important drivers of the stronger euro at the start of this year, even as fundamental economics favors a stronger green back.

Last week in the FX market, the Dollar index was on the back foot after Secretary of State Rex Tillerson was removed from office by President Trump. Moreover, the possibility of additional import charges against China played a roll too. The downward momentum in the index persisted until Thursday when the Dollar was saved by the robust Empire State Manufacturing figure. The USD index ended Friday's session at 90.139, almost unchanged over the week. The single currency was in a hawkish mode at the start of the week as the US dollar was subdued. It was a light week in terms of economic data for the euro-zone, hence the euro's direction was mainly correlated with US dollar movements. The euro also managed to close the week were it started off, at 1.2287.

It was a different story for the Sterling pound. The pound was one of the best performing currencies last week supported by some renewed optimism over ongoing Brexit negotiations. UK junior Brexit minister Robin Walker stated that "we recognize how important it is to secure the deal on the implementation period as soon as possible. I want to stress that we are very close to a deal at this time". On the EU side, an unnamed diplomat was quoted saving "the UK was seriously prepared", and that "means let's get on with it". The GBP gained 0.62 percent over the USD last week. Safe haven yen continues to be in demand as investors are worried about global trade tensions and high turnover rate at the White House. The yen encountered some weakness on Tuesday pressured by political scandal surrounding Prime Minister Shinzo Abe's government, however the weakness was short lived. The Japanese yen has already appreciated 6 percent versus the US dollar in 2018 and as geopolitical risks continue to mount that opens further room for the yen to increase. The USD depreciated by 0.94 percent versus the JPY in last week's session. In the commodities complex, the precious metal was consolidating throughout last week as global trade tensions were matched by expectations that the FED will hike interest rates next week on March the 21st. Gold closed the week

US inflation

Both headline and core consumer price growth accelerated by 0.2 percent on a monthly basis in February, in line with earlier projections. In annual terms, consumer inflation came in at 2.2 percent from 2.1 percent recorded in the previous reading, while the core data remained stagnant at 1.8 percent. The inflation data came after the latest jobs report, which showed wage growth remained subdued. Combining both wage and consumer inflation data together decreases the probability for US policy makers to speed up the pace of monetary tightening. For the core figure to pick up more significantly and raise the pace of overall inflation, wages need to accelerate. The main theme was that core inflation remained unchanged. The data will have little impact on this month's FOMC meeting, at which Fed Chairman Jerome Powell is broadly expected to raise rates by 25 basis

On the producer front, prices in the wholesale market proressed to an annual rate of 2.8 percent from 2.7 percent in January as the PPI increased by 0.2 percent m/m. The robust inflationary data however was in the core figure that excludes food, energy and trade services grew 0.4 percent, matching January's gain. In the 12 months through February, core PPI increased 2.7 percent, the biggest gain since August 2014.

Retail sales data

Growth in US retail sales has been sluggish recently with sales deteriorating for a third consecutive month, the sequential occurrence of such negative data has not transpired in nearly six years. One reason why overall retail sales have weakened recently relates to reduction in auto sales. Auto sales surged to a high of 18.5m annually last September, due to a wave of replacement purchases for vehicles that were damaged by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. Since then, auto sales have dropped back, slowing to 17.0m. The Commerce Department concluded that retail sales slipped 0.1 percent last month, while the core data rose by 0.1 percent. After persistent negative data in retail sales, which accounts to a significant portion of US GDP, the Atlanta Fed reduced its estimate for Q1 growth to a 1.9 percent annualized rate from an earlier estimate of 2.5 percent.

February's consumer inflation figure declined to an annual rate of 1.1 percent from 1.3 percent seen in the previous month. In the same month last year, the rate was 2 percent. The fall back in the headline data is attributed to deflation in unprocessed food prices and declining energy prices, data from the European Union's statistics office Eurostat showed. The core figure remained unchanged at 1 percent. On the wages front, annual hourly labor costs growth slowed from 1.6 percent in Q3 to 1.5 percent in Q4. Overall, the central banks goal of a widespread rise in underlying inflation is no wear to be seen and although the Bank may end its bond buying program at the end of 2018, increasing interest rates in early 2019 seems less likely.

Inflation expectations

As anticipated, the Swiss National Bank sustained its policy rates (sight deposit rate at -0.75 percent and 3-month Libor target range at -1.25 percent/-0.25 percent) that were implemented in early 2015. The slight surprise was that the SNB revised down its inflation estimates by 0.1 percent for 2018 and 0.2 percent for 2019, while maintaining its growth forecast of 2 percent for the current year. The modification of inflation projections is due to the appreciation of the CHF. As a result, the central bank described the franc as highly over valued and stressed once again the significance of negative rates and FX interventions to curb the currency's strength. They expect inflation to reach 2 percent in late 2020, thus policy rates may not tighten before 2019.

BoJ's meeting minuets

Meeting minutes from the Bank of Japan revealed most monetary policy makers on the board share the view that the current strategy should persist due to the lack of inflationary pressures. The Governor articulated the Bank could engineer a smooth withdrawal from its easy monetary policy. However, it is too early to debate specifics with price growth still distant from its target. Inflation is barely above 1 percent, so the BoJ is in no urgency to scale back stimulus even as the costs of prolonged easing mount. In regards to Japan's public debt, the current monetary strategy has greatly enhanced the country's debt making it more challenging to maintain the current policy rate. Sluggish wage upturns have become the main drag on BoJ's efforts to raise inflation even as the government forced corporations to elevate employee salaries.

Robust data out of China

Industrial production and fixed asset investment incurred a robust start for the current year, with advancements for both measures coming in above estimates. In the first two months of the year, industrial output accelerated to a six months high of 7.2 percent annually, up from 6.3 percent in 2017. The positive shift is attributed to strong production in machinery, equipment and electronics. High-tech merchandises saw robust annualized growth of 25.1 percent with a 178 percent increase in volumes. Looking at fixed asset investment, the figure grew 7.9 percent year on year from 7.2 percent. Higher investment also coincides with the improving expectations component of the PMI survey, with greater future demand is expected and therefore more investment plans to go ahead. Economic forecasters had projected a slight decline due to a crackdown on heavily polluting industries. But the data showed otherwise as steel production rose to its highest in months.

Wall St tech love affair might end in tears

SAN FRANCISCO: Outsized returns delivered by Amazon.com, Netflix and other heavyweight technology stocks have made them heroes on Wall Street, but some strategists warn that investors' reliance on them exacerbates the risk of a steep downturn.

Amazon's 35 percent surge in 2018 has pushed its market capitalization up to \$770 billion, equivalent to 3 percent of the S&P 500 and close behind Apple's nearly 4 percent share of the index.

Apple, Facebook, Amazon, Netflix and Google-parent Alphabet have grown their collective market value by more than 40 percent in the past year to \$3 trillion, and they now account for a quarter of the Nasdaq Composite Index. Technology stocks have been widely viewed in recent months as a "crowded trade," a situation where most investors have the same opinion, increasing the potential for a volatile selloff if sentiment changes.

"It's a big momentum trade, investors don't care if they're paying 15 or 20 or even 50 times earnings," said Mike O'Rourke, Chief Market Strategist at JonesTrading. "The problem is, once those names start giving up those gains, then the market starts to have problems." Investors have been attracted to those stocks for good reason: Amazon's revenue ballooned 31 percent to \$178 billion last year, while Netflix is expected by analysts on average to more than double its net income to \$1.2 billion in 2018.

An expected interest rate hike by the US Federal Reserve on Wednesday may not have a strong effect on technology companies, which generally rely less than other kinds of companies on debt.

The S&P 500 information technology index dipped by an average of 0.3 percent in the five-session period following the Fed's four most recent rate hikes, in line with S&P 500, according to Thomson Reuters data. Investors nervous about how much longer a nine-year bull market can last have favored big tech names as among the most reliable on the stock market because their business models are often viewed as disruptive and less susceptible to economic downturns, at least over the long run.


The popularity of Amazon, which is pushing beyond online retail and cloud computing into supermarkets and even healthcare, has left it trading at 167 times expected earnings, up from around 100 a year ago, according to Thomson Reuters Datastream. By comparison, the S&P 500 is trading at about 17 times expected earnings.


"If you ask anyone right now, if it's a business owner they'll say they're afraid of Amazon. If they're an investor, they'll tell you Amazon is going up forever," said Andrew Bodner, president of Double Diamond Investment Group in Parsippany, New Jersey.

"Overall, it creates more volatility for the market because everyone owns Amazon, and if Amazon goes down you'll see that reflected," Bodner said. Investors' increased reliance on passively managed index funds has also contributed to the rally in technology shares because the companies' inclusion in the S&P 500 and other indexes means money will be poured into them even if they have expensive earnings multiples, O'Rourke said.

Momentum for some major technology stocks is already showing signs of moderation. Facebook has fallen 5 percent after hitting a record high at the start of February, with some investors worried that people are spending less time on the social media platform. Posing a potential threat to the rally, the S&P 500 technology index is trading at a relatively expensive 18.8 times expected earnings, 12 percent above its 15-year average, according to Thomson Reuters Datastream. While S&P 500 information technology earnings per share are expected to grow by a healthy 17.5 percent this year, that's less than last year's 20.8 percent surge and lower than the 19.5 percent earnings expansion expected for the entire S&P 500, according to Thomson Reuters I/B/E/S. Technology companies may be benefiting more modestly than others from corporate tax cuts enacted this year, according to CFRA investment strategist Lindsey Bell.

Even as the S&P 500 wavered over worries that President Donald Trump might spark a trade war, the Nasdaq on Monday closed at a record high, more than bouncing back from a deep selloff across Wall Street only a month ago. "People are going with what works, and if tech was working before the shakeout in February, then they're going to stay in it," said Joe Saluzzi, comanager of trading at Themis Trading in Chatham, New Jersey. — Reuters

World's biggest battery in Australia to trump Musk's

SYDNEY: British billionaire businessman Sanjeev Gupta will built the world's biggest battery in South Australia, officials said Friday, overtaking US star entrepreneur Elon Musk's project in the same state last year. The 120MW/140MWh battery storage facility will support a new solar farm at the Whyalla Steelworks, which was taken over by Gupta's GFG Alliance when it bought Australia's cash-strapped steelmaking giant Arrium last year.

The push towards more renewable energy projects in South Australia followed an "unprecedented" storm that hit in 2016, causing a state-wide blackout. "Today's announcement is another example of how South Australia ... is leading the world in renewable energy," state Premier Jay Weatherill said in a statement. "As well as being the most powerful battery in the world, SIMEC ZEN Energy's storage facility will help underpin the long-term viability of the Whyalla steelworks, as well as provide additional benefits to the South Australian grid."

The announcement came a day before the Labor state government goes to the polls in a tight election race that has seen energy policy at the heart of the final days of campaigning. The state's main opposition party, the Liberals, has sought to distinguish its energy policy from Labor by supporting the development of an additional connection to the power grid instead.

The new battery storage project-at Port Augusta some 300 kilometers north of Adelaide-will be supported by a Aus\$10 million (US\$7.8 million) grant from Weatherill's government. Musk, the maverick billionaire and founder of Tesla, had pledged on Twitter last year to built a battery farm with a self-imposed deadline of having it ready in 100 days. The 100 MW/129 MWh battery, located in the rural town of Jamestown north of Adelaide, was switched on in late 2017 and connected to a wind farm operated by French energy firm Neoen.

It is meant to help tackle power shortages, reduce intermittencies and address demands in summer, when most of the country experiences its highest energy usage. Musk is also working with the state government on a landmark plan to give 50,000 homes solar panels and Tesla batteries. The network of solar panels linked to rechargeable batteries will be financed by the sale of excess electricity generated by the network, Weatherill said last month. — AFP



China to see driverless cars in 3-5 years: Baidu

BEIJING: Self-driving cars will hit the roads in China "within three to five years", the founder of Chinese internet giant Baidu, one of the world's leading designers of driverless cars, said. That is a lot sooner than predicted by China's information technology minister, who last week said it would only be reality in 8-10 years, citing constraints related to security. "I'm more optimistic than him, I think it will come sooner," Baidu CEO Robin Li said in Beijing on the sidelines of a consultative political assembly of which he is a member.

Baidu, often referred to as China's Google, operates the country's leading search engine and also invests heavily in

services ranging from online payments to connected devices and artificial intelligence. Like Google, the Chinese company is spending on research and development to put a driverless car on the road.

In 2019, in cooperation with local manufacturers, the Beijing-based company plans to launch a car featuring "a high degree of autonomy," Li told reporters. "Highly automated driving means ... for example, on a Beijing to Shanghai trip, as long as you stay on the highway, you will not have to worry about anything-you can eat hotpot or sing inside while you're waiting to arrive," he said.

The driver would still, however, need to take the wheel again as soon as the car moved away from major highways. "But in the next three to five years, I believe totally autonomous cars will make their appearance on the roads," he said. In September the company established a \$1.5 billion fund dedicated to developing driverless cars. It also manages an open platform where it shares its technologies with designers and builders. — AFP

Facebook critics want investigation after data misuse

SAN FRANCISCO: Facebook Inc faced new calls for regulation from within US Congress and was hit with questions about personal data safeguards on Saturday after reports a political consultant gained inappropriate access to 50 million users' data starting in 2014. Facebook disclosed the issue in a blog post on Friday, hours before media reports that conservative-leaning Cambridge Analytica, a data company known for its work on Donald Trump's 2016 presidential campaign, was given access to the data and may not have deleted it.

The scrutiny presented a new threat to Facebook's reputation, which was already under attack over Russians' alleged use of Facebook tools to sway American voters before and after the 2016 US elections. "It's clear these platforms can't police themselves," Democratic US Senator Amy Klobuchar tweeted. "They say 'trust us.' Mark Zuckerberg needs to testify before Senate Judiciary," she added, referring to Facebook's CEO and a committee she sits on.

Root of the problem

Facebook said the root of the problem was that researchers and Cambridge Analytica lied to it and abused its policies, but critics on Saturday threw blame at Facebook as well, demanding answers on behalf of users and calling for new regulation. Facebook insisted the data was misused but not stolen, because users gave permission, sparking a debate about what constitutes a hack that must be disclosed to customers.

"The lid is being opened on the black box of Facebook's data practices, and the picture is not pretty," said Frank Pasquale, a University of Maryland law professor who has written about Silicon Valley's use of data. Pasquale said Facebook's response that data had not technically been stolen seemed to obfuscate the central issue that data was apparently used in a way contrary to the expectations of users. "It amazes me that they are trying to make this about nomenclature. I guess that's all they have left," he said.

Democratic US Senator Mark Warner said the episode bolstered the need for new regulations about internet advertising, describing the industry as the "Wild West." "Whether it's allowing Russians to purchase political ads, or extensive micro-targeting

based on ill-gotten user data, it's clear that, left unregulated, this market will continue to be prone to deception and lacking in transparency," he said.

With Republicans controlling the Senate's majority, though, it was not clear if Klobuchar and Warner would prevail. The New York Times and London's Observer reported on Saturday that private information from more than 50 million Facebook users improperly ended up in the hands of Cambridge Analytica, and the information has not been deleted despite Facebook's demands beginning in 2015.

Exploring legal action

Some 270,000 people allowed use of their data by a researcher, who scraped the data of all their friends as well, a move allowed by Facebook until 2015. The researcher sold the data to Cambridge, which was against Facebook rules, the newspapers said. Cambridge Analytica worked on Trump's 2016 campaign. A Trump campaign official said, though, that it used Republican data sources, not Cambridge Analytica, for its voter information.

Facebook, in a series of written statements beginning late on Friday, said its policies had been broken by Cambridge Analytica and researchers and that it was exploring legal action. Cambridge Analytica in turn said it had deleted all the data and that the company supplying it had been responsible for obtaining it. Andrew Bosworth, a Facebook vice president, hinted the company could make more changes to demonstrate it values privacy. "We must do better and will," he wrote on Twitter, adding that "our business depends on it at every level."

Facebook said it asked for the data to be deleted in 2015 and then relied on written certifications by those involved that they had complied. Nuala O'Connor, president of the Center for Democracy & Technology, an advocacy group in Washington, DC, said Facebook was relying on the good will of decent people rather than preparing for intentional misuse.

Moreover, she found it puzzling that Facebook knew about the abuse in 2015 but did not disclose it until Friday. "That's a long time," she said. Britain's data protection authority and the Massachusetts attorney general on Saturday said they were launching investigations into the use of Facebook data. "It is important that the public are fully aware of how information is used and shared in modern political campaigns and the potential impact on their privacy," UK Information Commissioner Elizabeth Denham said in a statement. Massachusetts Attorney General Maura Healey's office said she wants to understand how the data was used, what policies if any were violated and what the legal implications are. — Reuters





Iraqi enthusiasts search for relics of royal past

t the heart of a Baghdad flea market, nostalgia for Iraq's royal past is on full display as collectors and investors gather to buy relics from a bygone era. Inside the Moudallal cafe, Arabic for "pampered", a hundred men from across the country carefully follow the auction of momentos from the nearly four decades of monarchic rule that ended with a bloody coup in 1958. "There is a feeling of nostalgia among the customers. Take the banknotes, their manufacture and quality were much better before, that's why the prices go up," says 52-year-old auctioneer Ali Hikmat.

With a booming voice, the towering man who has worked in the covered market since 1992 offers his goods up for to the highest bidder. All sorts of keepsakes are up for grabs: banknotes, coins, stamps and decorations. Most date back to Iraq's royal era, but there are also a few items from the early days of the republic that followed after general Abdel Karim Kassem toppled the monarchy. Nothing is on offer from the decades of dictatorship under Saddam Hussein.

'It was better before'

For the Iraqis hunting out their own souvenir of the past, the period of royal rule represents a golden age for their country. The founding of the Kingdom of Iraq under Faisal I-who fought alongside T.E. Lawrence during World War I-marked the emergence of the modern state after the fall of the Ottoman empire. The country gained independence in 1932 and the monarchy lasted until Faisal II was executed

during the coup. "Of course we are nostalgic for the royal period. All the main structures in this country were built during that period, be it bridges, dams and the rest," says 53-year-old Ahmad Kamal, who owns a real estate agency in Baghdad.

"The royal era marks the beginning of the Iraqi state," he says. "If we compare it to today, it was much better before." The comparison between the past and present is a potent one-as Iraq recovers from its latest round of devastation and bloodshed following the campaign against the Islamic State group. That violence is just the latest to roil the country that has been through war with Iran, the US-led invasion and a brutal sectarian conflict since the 1980s. Saad Mohsen, a professor of modern history at the University of Baghdad, insists that back under the constitutional monarchy Iraq was "more democratic and cleaner than today".

"We were far from the blood and fighting that we have come to know," he says. For clothing merchant Hussein Hakim, searching out

souvenirs from previous epochs helps him to delve into Iraq's rich heritage. "The past fascinates me," he says. "I'm interested in the history of my country through the objects I collect

from the Ottoman period up until the republic, but it's the royal era that I prefer most," the 43-year-old adds, proudly displaying two effigies of King Ghazi and King Faisal II.

The weekly auction in this small cafe is exceptional not only because of the sheer num-

ber of items on sale, but also because everything must be sold regardless of the price, allowing a lucky few to do snap up some bargains. But the desire for all things connected with the era of royalty does not mean Iraqis are looking to bring back the monarch.

Sharif Ali Ben Hussein, who claims to be the legitimate heir to the Iraqi throne, has never managed to get elected to parliament. In the wake of the 2003 US invasion, he returned to Baghdad after 45 years in exile but his claim that "a clear majority" of people wanted the monarchy back failed to gain traction.

For Adel Karim Sabri, who runs the magazine "My Hobby" specializing in stamps and old bank notes, "the past is always more beautiful because it is made of memories".

And for many of those shopping at this market of memories, scouring for relics appears to have more to do with financial gain than historical interest. "They buy because they have money and it's a good investment," the 76-year-old says.— AFP

From 'the sticks' to opera top bill, thanks to karaoke

winging with the karaoke micro-phone, Lucas Meachem belted out an "I Believe I Can Fly" that would instantly put to shame any unsuspecting amateur who stumbled into the cozy New York bar. His voice packing an R&B brassiness yet refined with an unforced vibrato, Meachem is no dabbler in bar singing. He is one of opera's rising stars, recently completing a stint as a male lead in "La Boheme" at New York's Metropolitan Opera-and karaoke was key to his success.

Raised in rural North Carolina, Meachem got his big break in 2006 when he visited Paris for the first time as part of a fellowship and decided to make his move as opera glitterati went out drinking.

Meachem got on the karaoke machine and sang "I Believe I Can Fly," R. Kelly's ballad of discovering personal strength, and so impressed mezzo-soprano Susan Graham that she recommended him for a part at Lyric Opera of Chicago.

But karaoke runs deeper for Meachem. The skill needed to master it-imitating another's voice-is how he entered opera. One of four children supported by a schoolteacher mother, Meachem grew up with little exposure to opera, but would mimic songs on the radio by Top 40 artists from Michael Jackson to Aerosmith's Steven Tyler-whose screeching climax on "Dream On" is another of Meachem's karaoke tricks. One Christmas his mother gifted him a tape of the Three Tenors-the legendary trio of Jose Carreras, Placido Domingo and Luciano Pavarotti. "It was next to godliness to me that these people could make this sound with the unamplified human voice," he told AFP at the Upper West Side bar where he showed off his karaoke prowess. "All of a sudden there was this type of singing that I could not replicate," he said. "After hearing that, it changed my life forever." "Sorry, Steven Tyler, Whitney Houston and Michael Jackson-rest in peace but you couldn't pique my interest in the same way, because I could already do that."

Straddling two worlds

Meachem-who has the strapping frame of a college athlete yet with piercing blue eves and a natural affability-voiced pride in his North Carolina roots but joked that he came from "the sticks." He acknowledged that starring at the Met, the most prestigious US opera house, gave him limited cachet with childhood friends. "I could go home and say, 'I'm singing at the Met and in Vienna and London and San Francisco and Chicago and then I say that I sang the national anthem at the Rangers game in New York and they say, 'The Rangers game-that's something else!" With his insight into two worlds, the 39-year-old has taken to writing strikingly forthright essays aimed at aspiring singers.

Devoid of any diva-like pretension, The Baritone Blog offers everything from advice on taxes (make sure you pay them!) to his thoughts on feeling out of place as an opera singer when he won a Grammy last year. Elsewhere on the blog, in what could have been a scene from "Les Miserables," he admitted stuffing his coat with food to survive when he was a student. He also resorted to calling up food companies to compliment them on their products, leading them to send him packages of samples that would hold him over. He said his experiences helped in "La Boheme" as he played Marcello, the struggling painter living among Paris bohemians. "Somebody who can't pay the bills-been there before. Somebody that can't pay his utility bill, so it's cold in the house, and he can't afford firewood been there, too," Meachem said. "There's a lot of life imitating art in that opera for me personally." Meachem also offers artistic guidance to new singers on The Baritone Blog. The most common mistake, he said, is not to sing in a forward position as opera, much unlike karaoke, involves no microphone. — AFP

From Paris with love: Depardieu votes in Russian election

ne of Russia's most famous citizens, French film star Gerard Depardieu, joined the millions who cast ballots in yesterday's presidential election. Depardieu, a friend of President Vladimir Putin who presented him with a Russian passport in 2013 during a tax row between the actor and French authorities, voted at the Russian embassy in Paris. The embassy tweeted a picture of the 69-year-old, wearing a coat with fur trim and sunglasses perched on his head, popping his ballot in the box. "Gerard Depardieu voted in the Russian presidential election at a polling station at the Russian embassy in France. Come!," it tweeted, urging other Russians in France to follow suit.

A video of the moment, tweeted by a reporter from Russian broadcaster RT, was widely circulated on French news sites, where it triggered a tide of mostly contemptuous responses. "I don't like insults but for me this man is a sellout," one person tweeted in French. Another posted a GIF of a man vomiting. Depardieu caused an uproar in 2012 when he declared he would hand back his French passport and move to Belgium to avoid a tax hike by the then Socialist government. His populari-

ty slumped further after he accepted a Russian passport-and a bear hug-from Putin.

The larger-than-life star of "Cyrano de Bergerac" and the Asterix & Obelix franchise, who is still a French citizen, has since become a staunch defender of the Kremlin's policies,

including its annexation of Crimea. "I'm a citizen of the world," he told Italian newspaper Corriere della Sera in 2016. "France is likely to become a Disneyland for foreigners, populated by imbeciles making wine and stinky cheese for

Thai graffiti artists lionize slain panther

angkok graffiti artists painted a mural on Friday of panthers seated at a "Last Supper" table, the latest subversive depiction of an animal that has come to symbolise injustice after a tycoon was accused of poaching the wild cat. Construction magnate Premchai Karnasuta, one of Thailand's wealthiest moguls, was arrested in a wildlife sanctuary in February with guns and animal carcasses, including that of a black leopard. The brazen violation of park rules unleashed a wave of anguish from environmental and political activists fed-up with the impunity enjoyed by

the kingdom's elites. With public protests still banned under a junta that grabbed power in 2014, the anger has taken the form of sly street art focused around the image of the panther. But the movement has turned into a cat-and-mouse game with authorities suspected of quickly painting over the panther art cropping up in public spaces around the nation. An animal rights group recently stepped in to pair street artists with private businesses willing to offer up their walls. That's how ten graffitists found themselves free to decorate the side of a Bangkok veterinary clinic on Friday. The group spent the afternoon spraying large black cats seated

behind a table in a nod to Leonardo da Vinci's "The Last Supper", which depicts Jesus' final meal with his apostles before his crucifixion. "There are (panthers) from each artist at the same table having dinner for the last time,"

explained a 28-year-old graffiti artist who goes by "Panda Dew". Phureerut Ratanavanich, who co-owns the veterinarian clinic, told AFP he hoped the mural would keep the panther story from falling off the front pages. — AFP
