Marine drills to be held

KUWAIT: The defense ministry announced yesterday that the naval forces will carry out a drill with live annunition today and tomorrow from 7 am till 6 pm (local time). The ministry said in a statement that the exercise will be held in the naval shooting range 16.5 nautical miles off East Ras Al-Julaia all the way to Qarouh island, and six miles east of Ras Al-Zour till Umm Al-Maradem island. It advised sea-goers to stay away from the zone during the drill. — KUNA

Afghan gunships killed 107

KABUL: Rockets and heavy machines guns fired from Afghan government helicopters killed and wounded at least 107 boys and men attending a religious ceremony near the northern city of Kunduz last month, according to a United Nations report yesterday. Last month, villagers in Dasht-i Archi district of Kunduz said dozens of people including many children had been killed in an attack on a religious ceremony, prompting the UN to launch an investigation. It said as many as 12 rockets may have been fired at the meeting, held in a field about the size of a football pitch, which was adjacent to a madrassa. — Reuters

Saudi fugitive killed

RIYADH: A Saudi national wanted for his alleged role in an April attack that left four policemen dead has been killed in a security operation, the Saudi interior ministry said yesterday. Khaled Al-Shehri had refused to surrender to security forces who had raided his family home on Saturday in the southern province of Asir, state-run Saudi Press Agency quoted a ministry official as saying. He threatened the police with a knife and was shot dead, the ministry source added. — AFP

BEIRUT: Lebanon's Iran-backed Hezbollah claimed victory yesterday after elections it said legitimized its military branch, leaving Saudi-backed Prime Minister Saad Hariri as the main loser. The two main protagonists of the country's first legislative polls in almost a decade did not wait for official results to comment on the implications of a vote which was also marked by low turnout. Hezbollah leader Hassan Nasrallah called the vote "a great political and moral victory for the resistance option that pro-

US Embassy signs go up in Jerusalem

JERUSALEM: US Embassy road signs went up in Jerusalem yesterday ahead of next week's opening of the mission in accordance with President Donald Trump's recognition of the city as Israel's capital. Trump says he is making good on US legislation and presidential pledges dating back decades. Other world powers have not done so, sidestepping one of the thorniest disputes between Israel and the Palestinians, who want their own state with East Jerusalem as the capital.

Workmen installed the black-and-white signs, in English, Hebrew and Arabic, along roads leading to a US

consulate building in south Jerusalem that will be remodelled as the embassy when it is formally relocated from Tel Aviv on May 14. "This is not a dream. It is reality. I am proud and moved to have hung this morning the first new signs that were prepared for the US Embassy," Jerusalem Mayor Nir Barkat wrote on Twitter.

Israel captured East Jerusalem from Jordanian control in the 1967 Middle East war and annexed it in a move not recognised internationally. The last round of peace talks on a Palestinian state in the West Bank and Gaza Strip collapsed in 2014. "This (embassy) move is not only illegal but will also thwart the achievement of a just and lasting peace between two sovereign and democratic states on the 1967 borders, Israel and Palestine living side by side in peace and security," Palestinian negotiator Saeb Erekat said in a statement.

Trump will not attend the opening. The US delegation will include Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin, Trump's daughter Ivanka Trump and his son-in-law, Jared **Continued on Page 11**

Palestinians slam Gulf presence in Israel cycle race

RAMALLAH: Palestinians have expressed outrage at teams from the United Arab Emirates and Bahrain for taking part in the opening legs of the Giro d'Italia cycling race in Israel over the weekend, which they say undermined Arab solidarity with their cause. The presence of the Gulf states' teams in the top cycling race - which has now moved on to its home territory in Italy - broke a boycott of Israel in place since the start of the Arab-Israeli conflict in 1948. "It's a mistake," Abdullah Al-Shayji, a professor at Kuwait University, wrote on his Twitter account about the Gulf teams racing in Israel. "Normalization with the occupation entity should be rejected, no matter what form it takes."

In an unusually barbed statement to a fellow Arab country, the Palestinian Olympic Committee said their participation was "a stab in the back to the great sacrifices made by the Palestinian people ... and a free service for the occupation". UAE officials did not immediately respond to Reuters' requests for comment and Bahrain's ministry of information referred questions to the team itself. Neither of the teams immediately responded to emailed inquiries.

None of the cyclists in either of the 8-men teams - Bahrain-Merida and UAE Team Emirates appeared to be Bahraini or Emirati citizens and were almost all European, according to profiles on the event's official website. However, in an important break with traditional Arab protocols on events in Israel, the riders wore jerseys emblazoned with national colors and brand names of sponsors, stateowned Emirates Airlines and the Bahrain Petroleum Company, the official Twitter accounts for the team websites showed.



Kuwaiti-Turkish relationship cemented with cooperation

ANKARA: Turkish Prime Minister Binali Yildirim is scheduled to pay an official visit to the State of Kuwait today on a mission destined to fortify further the decades' old excellent bonds between the two states. These distinctive relations have been based on mutual friendship, bolstered with cooperation at the political, economic and cultural levels. Premier Yildirim is coming to Kuwait at an invitation by His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Hamad Al-Sabah, who visited Turkey in September. His mission had peaked with inking six treaties and memos of cooperation in diverse fields. Moreover, a simultaneous joint economic forum was hosted by Istanbul, attended by leading representatives of the two countries' private sectors.

Kuwaiti-Turkish relations have recently taken strides upward; largely due to the two states' common views regarding various issues, thus the relationship has developed to the level of a partnerships, based on mutual respect and interests. The two countries, peoples of which are mostly Muslims, with close geographical locations, have employed the cultural and historic bonds to bolster the friendship. The Kuwaiti-Turkish relations date back to 1969 when they inked a treaty for establishing diplomatic relations, followed with opening embassies in the two countries in 1970; which also witnessed the inking of an accord for land transport cooperation-for passengers and cargo.

In 1975, the two sides inked a cultural agreement and another for cooperation in aerial services in 1977. Moreover, they signed a cooperation agreement in the economic, industrial and technical sectors in 1982, a mail accord in 1986 and another for encouraging and protecting investments in 1988.

Following the liberation, the relations noticeably took further steps upward following a visit by the late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah to Ankara in November 1991, during which he expressed gratitude to Turkey's solidarity with Kuwait against the aggressors and its legitimate rights.

Since early hours of the 1990 Iraqi aggression, Turkey decried the barbaric offensive, describing it an aggression against the international laws, the international legitimacy, demanding that sovereignty and independence be restored to Kuwait. Furthermore, Turkey following the invasion decided to prohibit exports of Iraqi oil via its territories, declared solidarity with the international coalition that carried out the liberation operation and effectively contributed to the alliance despite economic losses.

In October 1997, the late Turkish president Suleyman Demirel visited Kuwait, holding talks with the late Amir Sheikh Jaber on ties and issues of common interest. During the visit, the two sides inked two accords, one on averting double taxation and the other on cultural cooperation.

In turn, Kuwait expressed support for the democratically elected Turkish government against the foiled coup that happened in July 2016, where His Highness the Amir cabled the Turkish president congratulating him on the democracy victory.

During the first visit to Turkey by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah, in 2008, the two countries signed seven treaties for cooperation in the economic, scientific and technical fields. They also formed a higher cooperation commission at the level of foreign ministers and another for labor cooperation. The two sides endorsed, during His Highness the Amir second visit to Turkey, in April 2013, eight accords in aviation, aerial cargo, higher education, scientific research, health, livestock, military industries, cultural cooperation, in addition to the cooperation between Saud Al-Nasser Diplomatic Institute and the Turkish Diplomacy Academy, as well a visa exemption accord for holders of diplomatic and special passports. Kuwait and Turkey signed a large number of agreements between 2008 and 2014; most notably was a memo for expertise swap, training, military education and holding joint military drills.

They had also signed, during ministers' reciprocal visits, multiple agreements, one stipulating formation of a common commission, others on labor swap, environment protection, safeguarding natural resources for sustainable development, boosting industrial exports, cooperation in customs, economic, scientific and technical cooperation, agricultural and technical realms.

In 2014, they inked agreements for military training, cooperation in the press, media, maritime commercial transports and a protocol for cooperation in archives. They have been bonded with 54 treaties, including three signed during the Turkish premier visit to Kuwait in November 2017, in sports, direct investments, scientific research and technology.

During the latest visit by His Highness the Amir to Turkey, in March 2017, President Recep Tayyip Erdogan decorated His Highness with the state top medal in appreciation for His Highness' great role in boosting the bilateral relations, as well as for his paramount contributions to humanitarian relief worldwide. His Highness the Amir had awarded President Erdogan Mubarak Al-Kabeer medal in appreciation for his pivotal role at the bilateral and international levels. In November 2009, His Highness the Amir visited Istanbul heading the State of Kuwait delegation at the 25th meeting of the permanent committee for econom ic and commercial cooperation of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). His Highness headed the State of Kuwait delegation at the 13th session of the OIC Summit in Istanbul in April 2016, the global summit for humanitarian action, also held in Istanbul in May the same year. His Highness had also led the State of Kuwait delegation at the OIC extraordinary summit on Jerusalem, also hosted by Istanbul, in December 2017.

Former Turkish President Abdullah Gul had paid three visits to Kuwait in February of 2009 and 2011, and March 2014 as part of the Turkish-Kuwaiti leaderships' continued efforts to support and bolster their friendship and cooperation. President Recep Tayyip Erdogan had also visited Kuwait in April 2015, and once again in May 2017 to inaugurate a new terminal at Kuwait International Airport that was built by the Turkish-based company Limak Construction. Erdogan has also paid a visit to the country in July 2017 to support Kuwait's mediation efforts toward solving the Gulf crisis, and most recently in November 2017. In 2016, trade volume between Kuwait and Turkey reached \$1.287 billion. Turkish exports to Kuwait amounted to \$431 million, and imports to \$856 million. Furthermore, the total value of Turkish projects in Kuwait, carried out by Turkish construction companies, reached \$6.5 billion in 2016, while Kuwait's direct investment volume in Turkey reached \$1.7 billion in that same year. More Kuwaiti companies and individuals are investing in Turkey, prompting the Ankara government to waive visa on Kuwaiti citizens.

At the parliamentary level, former speaker Cemil Cicek paid an official visit to Kuwait in January 2014, while Kuwait National Assembly Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanim visited Ankara in February 2016.

Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) began operations in Turkey in 1979, extending loans to build development projects in many sectors. KFAED offered, up until November 2009, 12 loans totaling KD 106 million, which equals \$352 million.

Kuwait also contributed to meet humanitarian needs in Turkey, whether from citizens or Syrian refugees. The GCC-member state offered up to \$20 million of health and educational services for the Syrian refugees in Turkey. His Highness the late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah had personally donated \$1 million to help alleviate the suffering of victims of the earthquake that struck Turkey. In November 2014, His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah's "Humanitarian Leader Village" was opened in the eastern city of Van, and was subjected later to a devastating earthquake in 2011, which killed 644 people, injured 4,152 others, and destroyed 2,262 houses.

Another Kuwaiti-financed village was built to house Syrian refugees in the southern city of Kilis. The Kuwaiti government and non-government organizations also contributed heavily in assisting the Syrian refugees in Turkey, offering financial and material aid in order to ease their suffering.

Kuwait also hosted three international donor conferences to help the Syrian people, pledging a total of \$7.5 billion, of them Kuwait contributed \$1.3 billion. Moreover, Kuwait's medical teams, including 'Shefaa' voluntary group, Kuwaiti Medical Society, and Patients Helping Fund Society conducted several surgical operations and treatments on wounded Syrian refugees in Al-Amal Hospital in Al-Rihaneya district of Hatay province in southern Turkey. — KUNA

Kuwait eager to interact with Silk City project: Sheikh Nasser

'Kuwait faces a great challenge in implementing the project'

KUWAIT: First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense Sheikh Nasser Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah expressed yesterday sincere eagerness to interact socially and politically with the northern Kuwait and Silk City development projects. Works on these two projects are currently in early stages, Sheikh Nasser said in his opening speech at a workshop, entitled

'Kuwait's Northern Gulf Gateway Project: Silk City' organized by the World Bank's Kuwait Office. Silk City was not just a mere vision, but it has been a reality in Kuwait since the preoil discovery period, he said.

Kuwait thrives on its courteous and friendly culture, which welcomes and helps everyone without discrimina-

tion of their religion or ethnic backgrounds, he added. "This is exactly what we need to do; rehabilitate the location of Silk City and put it back on its previous historic place," said Sheikh Nasser Al-Sabah. Kuwait faces a great challenge in implementing the project, he said, affirming the country's ability to overcome such a major test just as it had always done with past major development plans.

Materializing His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah's "Kuwait 2035" vision began two years and three months ago, he said, affirming Kuwait's constant strive to provide assistance to neighboring countries. Due to geographic locations, many

Central Asian nations have limited links and access to trade and interact with other countries around the world, Sheikh Nasser noted. Thus, Kuwait intends to link Central Asia, South Russia, Mongolia, and rest of Asian countries with the world through Silk City, which would also serve other countries in the region as well, particularly Iran, Iraq, and Gulf states, he noted. Kuwait

is well-renowned for aiding many countries around the world as it is part of its genuine heritage, which is a blend of history, culture, commerce, and tourism, said Sheikh Nasser.

Gulf nations have a tendency of linking themselves with the rest of the world via several routes, including the Red Sea and Mediterranean

Sea, he noted. GCC states benefit highly from the Red Sea mountain areas in Saudi Arabia and the coastal city of Aqaba in Jordan, he said, pointing out the valuable minerals available in these areas that could be availed.

Sheikh Nasser urged neighboring countries to understand Kuwait's 2035 vision and cooperate with each other in peace and harmony to achieve the desired goal successfully. He also hoped the workshop benefits from the World Bank expertise, especially in reviewing the successes achieved by South American and Southeast Asian nations. He also called on the workshop's participants to review World Bank's positive and negative experiences to avoid mistakes and failure. --- KUNA

KFAED offers Vietnam KD 4 million loan

KUWAIT: Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development (KFAED) and Vietnam have signed a loan agreement worth KD 4 million (\$13.6 million) for financing the Multipurpose Development Project for Ethnic Minorities in Poor Communes in Xin Man District in Vietnam.

It was co-signed by Vietnamese Vice Minister of Finance Tran Xuan Ha and KFAED Deputy Director General Hesham Al-Waqayan, the fund said in a press release vesterday. KFAED has already provided 14 loans with a total amount of about KD 49.7 million (\$168.98 million) for financing projects in various sectors in Vietnam. - KUNA



MoI has no problem in lifting absconding reports upon sponsors' request: Official

Company received 5,000 requests to hire domestic helpers

KUWAIT: The Ministry of Interior (MoI) has no problem in lifting absconding reports upon sponsors' request, a senior ministry official said vesterday. Furthermore, the ministry is fine with the possibility of lifting the ban on domestic helpers from certain nationalities provided the foreign minister approves it, Assistant Undersecretary for Citizenship and Passports Maj Gen Sheikh Mazen Al-Jarrah said.

The official was speaking during a ceremony organized yesterday to launch the new citizen services center at Al-Durra Labor Company in Sharq. Responding to a question about transferring the domestic helpers' department from MoI to the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor (MSAL), Sheikh Mazen stressed that both ministries are the same and that they always cooperate and coordinate the process of recruiting domestic helpers from abroad in mary school dropouts. a manner that reflects

Kuwait's leading role. The new center's open-

ing ceremony was attended by residency affairs director Maj Gen Talal Maarafi, Al-Durra Chairman Eyad Al-Sumait and Al-Durra General Manager Saleh Al-Wehaib. Sheikh Mazen said the new center is an embodiment of ongoing cooperation between MoI and Al-Durra with the aim of providing

the best quality services to citizens seeking the recruitment of domestic helpers. "We have more citizen service centers in Kuwait than restaurants," Sheikh Mazen quipped, noting that there are over 50 centers.

Meanwhile, Sumait said the company has so far received over 5,000 requests to hire domestic helpers of both genders and that 500 workers had been already provided. He added the company provides a six-month probation period for both helpers and sponsors, after which they decide whether to continue with their contracts or cancel them. He said it takes from 35 days to three months to recruit a domestic helper from other countries.

Govt employees increase

Recent statistics issued by the Civil Service Commission (CSC) showed that the total number of public sector employees is 349,691, an increase of 10,751 employees compared to the first quarter of 2017, when there were

338,940 employees. The statistics also explained that 42.33 percent, ie 148,009, were male employees, while 57.67 percent (201,682) were female employees. Moreover, statistics showed that 75.55 percent of the government's workforce (264,195) comprises of citizens, while GCC nationals number 4,563, other Arabs 49,337 and foreign expats 31,596.

Statistics showed that the majority of civilian employees worked for the Ministry of Education (MoE) with 113,875 employees, followed by the Ministry of Health (MoH) with 63,508, the Ministry of Electricity and Water (MEW) with 20,749 and the Ministry of Interior (MoI) with 20,536 employees. CSC statistics also explained that 5,437 of government employees are PhD holders, 11,441 master's degree holders, 160,446 are university degree holders, 54,502 hold diplomas, 65,860 hold school leaving certificates and 11,059 (including 3,328 citizens) are pri-

at Kuwait University (KU) said that orders to construct and maintain a multi-storey parking complex at the Kaifan and Khaldiya campuses have been changed upon a request from the construction and maintenance department. The sources added that the change will affect 4.89 percent of the

He also stressed that one of the program's main aims is to preserve citizens' current living standards, giving an example of keeping fuel prices stable since Sept 2016 to be amongst the lowest in the GCC states and the world, which costs KD 1.623 billion in fuel and energy subsidies; ie 47 percent of the amount allocated for subsidies in the 2018-2019 fiscal year's budget.

KUWAIT: Kuwait Fire Service Directorate (KFSD) said firemen dealt with a traffic accident on Sixth Ring Road that resulted in a fire. Three persons were injured and handed to paramedics. The fire was put out by Jahra occupational fire center.

Fatal accident

An unidentified person drove a rental car in the wrong direction for more than 10 km on the Sixth Ring Road, finally colliding head on with another vehicle driven by a citizen. Both cars caught fire and both drivers were killed. The coroner recovered both bodies.

Drug overdose

14 citations

Second Indian teen raped, set on fire

Girl raped, doused in kerosene and set alight

NEW DELHI: A 17-year-old Indian girl was fighting for her life yesterday after being raped, doused in kerosene and set alight, the second such case to shake the country this week as it reels from a series of brutal sexual assaults. The teenager was attacked on Friday-the same day a 16-year-old was raped and burned to death, also in the eastern state of Jharkhand. The two incidents have shone a spotlight on the treatment of rape in India, where authorities are facing renewed pressure to act on sexual crimes after the recent gang rape and murder of an eightyear-old girl. The cases are some of the most high-profile since the 2012 rape and murder of a student on a New Delhi bus that triggered mass protests. "The girl has suffered 70 percent first-degree burns. There is a chance that she will survive," Shailendra Barnwal, police superintendent of Pakur district said. The victim has been moved to a private hospital with specialist facilities for "proper treatment and recovery", he said. Police have arrested a 19-year-old man who lives in the

same neighbourhood as the victim. "He poured kerosene on the girl and set her on fire," Barnwal said. Fifteen people have been detained in the case of the 16-year-old, who was

torched to death in the state's Chatra district. The main suspect in that case is said to have been angered by a village council punishment of 100 sit-ups and a \$750 fine for raping the girl. He attacked her parents before setting their house on fire with the teenager inside. Some 40,000 rape cas-

Some 578 rape cases were reported in Delhi up to April 15, against 563 in 2017 in the same period. Amid mounting outrage, the government has changed the law to allow execution for child rapists-but daily sexual assaults continue to be reported. Yesterday, a female lawyer from the low-caste Dalit community accused a senior lawyer associated with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of rape and blackmail. "I am scared as he is threatening my family. I am being made to face this only because I am a Dalit," the woman, who covered her face to remain anonymous, said at a televised news protest the lack of official action and threatened to kill herself if nothing was done against the accused. Why is US moving its embassy to Jerusalem?

JERUSALEM: The United States opens its new embassy in Jerusalem on May 14, a move that has delighted Israel and infuriated Palestinians. Yesterday, road signs directing traffic there went up around the neighborhood where it will be situated, and next week's opening ceremony is timed to coincide with Israel's 70th anniversary. The initiative was driven by President Donald Trump, after he broke last year with decades of US policy by recognizing Jerusalem as the capital of Israel.

Trump said his administration has a peace proposal in the works, and recognizing Jerusalem as the capital of America's closest ally had "taken Jerusalem, the toughest part of the negotiation, off the table." Israel's prime minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, celebrated Trump's decision, but the move upset the Arab world and Western allies. Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas called it a "slap in the face" and said Washington could no longer be regarded as an honest broker in any peace talks with Israel. Initially, a small interim embassy will operate from the building in southern Jerusalem that now houses US consular operations, while a secure site is found to move the rest of the embassy operations from Tel Aviv.

Why Jerusalem?

There has long been pressure from pro-Israel politicians in Washington to move the embassy to Jerusalem, and Trump made it a signature promise of his 2016 election campaign. The decision was popular with many conservative and evangelical Christians who voted for Trump and Vice President Mike Pence, many of whom support political recognition of Israel's claim to the city. Trump acted under a 1995 law that requires the United States to move its embassy to Jerusalem, but to which other presidents since then - Bill Clinton, George W Bush and Barack Obama - consistently signed waivers.

Jerusalem, Mideast conflict

Religion, politics and history. Jerusalem has been fought over for millennia by its inhabitants, and by regional powers and invaders. It is sacred to Judaism, Christianity and Islam, and each religion has sites of great significance there. Israel's government regards Jerusalem as the eternal and indivisible capital of the country, although that is not recognized internationally. Palestinians feel equally strongly, saying that East

es were reported in India in 2016, but campaigners though say the real number is higher, with victims wary of making complaints because of social stigma.

Jerusalem must be the capital of a future Palestinian state. The city even has different names. Jews call it Jerusalem, or Yerushalayim, and Arabs call it Al-Quds, which means "The Holy". But the city's significance goes further.

At the heart of the Old City is the hill known to Jews across the world as Har ha-Bayit, or Temple Mount, and to Muslims internationally as Al-Haram al-Sharif, or The Noble Sanctuary. It was home to the Jewish temples of antiquity but all that remains of them above ground is a restraining wall for the foundations built by Herod the Great. Known as the Western Wall, this is a sacred place of prayer for Jews. Within yards of the wall, and overlooking it, are two Muslim holy places, the Dome of the Rock and Al-Aqsa Mosque, which was built in the 8th century. Muslims regard the site as the third holiest in Islam, after Mecca and Medina. The city is also an important pilgrimage site for Christians, who revere it as the place where they believe that Jesus Christ preached, died and was resurrected.

What is the city's modern history and status?

In 1947, the United Nations General Assembly decided that the then British-ruled Palestine should be partitioned into an Arab state and a Jewish state. But it recognized that Jerusalem had special status and proposed international rule for the city, along with nearby Bethlehem, as a 'corpus separatum' to be administered by the United Nations. That never happened. When British rule ended in 1948, Jordanian forces occupied the Old City and Arab East Jerusalem. Israel captured East Jerusalem from Jordan in the 1967 Middle East war and annexed it. In 1980 the Israeli parliament passed a law declaring the "complete and united" city of Jerusalem to be the capital of Israel. But the United Nations regards East Jerusalem as occupied, and the city's status as disputed until resolved by negotiations between Israel and the Palestinians.

Any embassy in Jerusalem?

In March Guatemala's president, Jimmy Morales, said that his country will move its embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem on May 16, two days after the US move. Netanyahu said in April that "at least half a dozen" countries were now "seriously discussing" following the US lead, but he did not identify them. In December, 128 countries voted in a non-binding UN General Assembly resolution calling on the United States to drop its recognition of Jerusalem as Israel's capital. Nine voted against, 35 abstained and 21 did not cast a vote.

What is likely to happen next?

Since Trump's announcement there have been Palestinian protests and wider political tensions. Arab leaders across the Middle East have warned the move could lead to turmoil and hamper US efforts to restart long-stalled Israeli-Palestinian peace talks. More than 40 Palestinians have been killed by Israeli troops in Gaza during a six-week border protest due to

A Palestinian protest escalated into the second intifada. Deadly confrontations also took place in July after Israel installed metal detectors at the complex's entrance after Arab-Israeli gunmen killed two Israeli policemen there. -Reuters

45 dead as militia, and bandits clash in Nigeria's north

KANO: Fighting between armed bandits and militiamen left 45 dead in northern Nigeria, police and a local militia said yesterday, amid escalating rural violence often involving cattle rustling, robbery and kidnappings. "The 45 bodies were found scattered in the bush. The bandits pursued residents who mobilized to defend the village after overpowering them," said a vigilante who asked not to be named for fear of reprisals. "The dead included children abandoned by their parents during the attack" in the village of Gwaska, in Kaduna state.

'The attackers were obviously armed bandits from neighboring Zamfara state who have been terrorizing Birnin Gwari area," he added. The Kaduna state police chief, Austin Iwar, confirmed the attack, saying: "There was violence between the militias, who are very powerful, and bandits." He could not break down the casualties, saying only: "For now all we know is that 12 people were buried yesterday and 33 today." The vigilante said the bandits struck at about 2:30 pm (1330 GMT) Saturday and stayed for three hours before retreating to their base in the forest in Zamfara. "They burnt down many homes," he said.

The killings follow the death of 13 people in prolonged clashes between cattle thieves and local civilian militia in Zamfara last week. The attacks underlined the diversity of Nigeria's security threats that persist because of an overstretched army and security forces. Rural communities in Zamfara have been under siege for several years from cattle rustlers and kidnapping gangs, who have raided herding communities, killing, looting and burning homes. To defend themselves, villages and herdsmen form vigilante groups, but they too are often accused of extra-judicial killings, provoking a bloody cycle of retaliatory attacks.

Adding to the proliferation of violence due to these criminal groups, Nigeria is in the grip of a security crisis as nomadic herders and sedentary farmers fight over land in an increasingly bloody battle for resources. Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari has been criticized for failing to curb the violence, which is becoming a key election issue ahead of presidential polls in 2019. The military and police are fighting Boko Haram jihadists in the north, militants and pirates in the oil-rich south, a simmering separatist movement in the east as well as the bloody conflict between herdsmen and farmers spanning the vast central region. -AFP

European powers make last-ditch appeal to save Iran nuclear deal

Scrapping deal would spark an 'escalation'

BERLIN: Britain, France and Germany made a last-ditch National Security Advisor John Bolton and Congressional forappeal yesterday to US President Donald Trump not to abandon the Iran nuclear deal as a key deadline approaches, warning that scrapping it would spark an "escalation". Trump has threatened to withdraw from the 2015 pact when it comes up for renewal on May 12, and

to reimpose sanctions unless European signatory states fix its "terrible flaws". German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas warned that the accord's collapse could spark "an escalation" in the region and stressed that Washington's kev European allies remain convinced saving it "makes the world a safer place". His French counterpart

Jean-Yves Le Drian, on a Berlin visit, said that the agreement is "the right way to stop Iran from getting access to nuclear weapons" and "will save us from nuclear proliferation". British Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson, who was visiting Washington vesterday, cautioned that "at this delicate juncture, it would be a mistake to walk away from the nuclear agreement and remove the restraints that it places on Iran". "Now that these handcuffs are in place, I see no possible advantage in casting them aside," Johnson wrote in The New York Times. He argued that "every available alternative is worse", adding that "the wisest course would be to improve the handcuffs rather than break them".

'United in our effort'

Under the landmark nuclear pact, also signed by Russia and China, Iran pledged not to build a nuclear bomb in return for relief from international sanctions. Trump has consistently complained about the agreement, reached under his predecessor Barack Obama, citing perceived flaws including "sunset" provisions lifting some nuclear restrictions from 2025. In an attempt to salvage the deal, French President Emmanuel Macron has pushed to extend its scope to address this issue, as well as Iran's missile capabilities and its role in the region.

Israel has also pushed to have the accord ditched, arguing that intelligence documents it recently unveiled showed that Iran had had a secret atomic weapons program which it could re-activate at any time. Britain, France and other signatories have said those arguments only strengthened the case for the deal, which has safeguards in place designed to keep Iran from pursuing atomic weapons. Johnson was yesterday to start a two-day visit to Washington, with the nuclear deal top of the agenda, the Foreign Office said.

Trapped: Many hurdles to repatriate foreigners sex trafficked to India

MUMBAI: Women are increasingly being trafficked into India's sex industry from countries outside South Asia that do not have repatriation agreements, which leaves victims trapped in limbo for months after being rescued, officials said. India has long been a destination for traffickers bringing women from neighboring Bangladesh, which has a repatriation treaty, and Nepal, which works closely with Indian authorities on the issue.

But nations beyond South Asia - Uzbekistan and Thailand in particular - have emerged as source countries over the past three years, according to police, campaigners and government data. "The (repatriation) process is streamlined for Bangladesh and Nepal. But now people are coming from other parts and we have no treaties with them," said Mahesh Bhagwat, police chief of Rachakonda

were 33 recorded cases of women trafficked from Bangladesh and 16 from Nepal, according to the government's annual Crime in India report.

In contrast, authorities in 2016 recorded 70 trafficking cases from Thailand and Uzbekistan, which were combined in the report. Previous reports did not mention victim's nationalities. An official at the National Crime Records Bureau said Thailand and Uzbekistan were named because most of the recorded trafficking cases in 2016 originated in those two countries. The number of trafficked foreign nationals recorded by authorities was lower in previous years, varying from 36 in 2010 to 13 in 2014.

Data is not yet available for 2017, but authorities said 40 Thai women were rescued from massage parlors acting as fronts for prostitution in Mumbai and Pune in the first half of last year alone. Another 34 Thai women were rescued later in 2017 from massage parlors and spas in the Telangana state capital of Hyderabad, Bhagwat told the Thomson Reuters Foundation yesterday. Bhagwat's team also rescued an Uzbek woman last year from the sex trade in Hyderabad, the state capital of Telangana. She committed suicide late last month, four months after her repatriation process began, he said. The embassies of Uzbekistan and



district in the southern state of Telangana. In 2016, there Thailand did not respond to phone calls and emails seeking comment. After being informed that a victim of trafficking from their country has been rescued, embassy officials need to verify the person's identity and home address. Campaigners say this can be difficult as victims sometimes provide false information, because they are afraid that traffickers may hurt them or their families. "These girls are controlled by traffickers and they are coerced into saying many things. They are deeply indoctrinated," said Sunitha Krishan, co-founder of the anti-trafficking charity Prajwala. Krishnan said the Uzbek woman who had been sheltering in one of Prajwala's facilities had been carrying forged Indian identity documents when she was rescued, and at first refused to say which country she was really from.

Krishnan urged more countries to make agreements with India to quickly repatriate those rescued from sex trafficking. Her call may take on more urgency if traffickers continue to cast their nets wider than South Asia - which campaigners say is likely. The massage parlor industry is booming and many customers prefer fair-skinned women from countries like Thailand and Uzbekistan, said Hasina Kharbhih, founder of the anti-trafficking group Impulse NGO Network. "The demand for foreign girls is growing in India," she said.—Reuters

BURIRAM: The sons of a convicted murderer, a rural "don" who has spun a fortune from football and gun-loving provincial bigwigs-as elections near, Thai junta leader Pravut Chan-O-Cha is cosving up to "influential figures", a group he vowed to expunge from politics with his coup four years ago. Throughout his rule Prayut, the mercurial ex-general whose army seized power in May 2014, has maintained one key refrain: politicians and their cronies are the cause of the country's political instability. But the 64-year-old is suddenly changing tune as he looks to complete a metamorphosis from dictator to elected leader at polls promised for 2019.

The retired general has been cov on formally announcing a run for office. Yet in recent months he has been busily courting the political fiefs that dominate the country, specifically potential allies of his nemesis, the billionaire former premier Thaksin Shinawatra. Yesterday Prayut arrived in Buriram, a northeastern province dominated by Newin Chidchob-an ex-politician turned sports mogul whose shape-shifting alliances have made him a key political "kingmaker".

He was welcomed by a full house of some 30,000 in Buriram FC's "Thunder Castle" stadium-an unprecedented reception for the junta leader, whose popularity is on the slide among the Bangkok middle class. Many will interpret the hearty welcome as sign of a deal between Prayut and Newin, who steers his Bhumjaithai Party from behind the scenes and has secured the lucrative rights to host MotoGP from this year in his rural backwater. Strutting across the field, microphone in hand, a jocular Newin urged crowds to cheer Prayut loudly to squeeze out cash from the government.

"The budget for your flood protection will be gone if your voice is not loud!" he said. A relaxed Prayut laid out his vision for the country, while also denying he was in town for political reasons. "I didn't come here to ask you

The Shinawatra clan have won all general elections since 2001, relying on their popular appeal in the rural north and northeast. Prayut toppled the government of Yingluck Shinatwara, who has now joined her brother Thaksin in self-exile after being convicted of criminal negligence. Their Pheu Thai party is weakened without the siblings' star power and Prayut is seeking to overrun them at elections with the support of provincial bossesand the vote banks they carry. "Prayut has become the ultimate hypocrite," said Paul Chambers, a Thailandbased expert on the kingdom's politics. After endless politician-bashing, "now Prayut and the (junta) are using many of these same corrupt politicians to build a political party."

'Political mafia'

What Newin might get for backing Prayut remains unknown. But his counterparts in eastern Chonburi province already appear to have been rewarded. Two prothers from the Kunplome clan, who dominate Thailand's eastern seaboard, were made cabinet-level advisors in April. Their family is headed by elderly Somchai, dubbed the "Godfather of Chonburi", who was released early from jail in December after serving a fraction of a 28-year sentence for masterminding the murder of a local politician.

Prayut has repeatedly denied any horsetrading is going on. But his meetings continue to raise eyebrows, including a golf outing with another influential clique-the Pheu Thailinked Sasomsap brothers in Nakhon Pathom. A few years ago they were targeted by a junta crackdown on "influential figures". Police raids found scores of guns in raids at their homes, according to local media. "Political mafia is a more appropriate term for these type of people," said Thai politics professor Titipol Phakdeewanich. The families maintain control through business links, donations and other "generous deeds", Titipol added. "Prayut understands how politics functions. If you want to win an election as a newcomer you have to collaborate with existing powers in provinces." - AFP

Russia's Putin sticks with same prime minister for a new term

Putin sworn in for fourth term as Russia president

MOSCOW: President Vladimir Putin stuck with his long-serving prime minister in his first act after being sworn in for a new term yesterday, signaling that he would keep faith with a policy direction that has brought Russia into conflict with the West. Standing in the ornately-decorated Andreyevsky Hall of the Grand Kremlin Palace, with his hand on a gold-embossed copy of the constitution, Putin, 65, swore to serve the Russian people, to safeguard rights and freedoms, and protect Russian sovereignty.

Putin won the new six-year term after more than 70 percent of voters backed him in a March 18 presidential election. His most dangerous challenger, Alexei Navalny, was not allowed to take part. Navalny was detained on Saturday at a protest called under the slogan: "Putin is

not our tsar." Soon after the inauguration ceremony, the Kremlin issued a statement saying that Putin had nominated Dmitry Medvedev to be prime minister in his new term. Medvedev, a loyal Putin lieutenant, has held the job since 2012.

The appointment needs to be approved by the lower house of parliament, but that is likely to be a formality

because the chamber is dominated by Kremlin loyalists. Some Kremlin-watchers had speculated Putin might bring in a fresh face as prime minister to kickstart reforms of the sluggish economy and revive foreign investment curtailed by stand-offs with the West. By choosing Medvedev - seen by people close to the Russian elite as a safe pair of hands whose chief quality is loyalty to his boss - Putin indicated he favored continuity.

6 killed in Yemen capital

SANAA: Two air raids targeted the office of the presidency in Yemen's rebel-held capital Sanaa yesterday, leaving at least six people killed and 30 wounded, a medical source said. The rebelrun Al-Masirah television blamed the Saudi-led coalition for the raids. Witnesses said the office, used by the Houthi rebel administration and located in the Tahrir district of Sanaa, is normally bustling with employees. Residents said they heard two powerful explosions hit the building, which is located near a hotel, a bank from seeking a third consecutive term. When Putin came up against the same term limits in 2008, he got around the problem by anointing Medvedev as president, before taking back the job after one term. Some observers believe Putin, who has not anointed any heir apparent, could attempt the same manoeuvre a second time.

For the short journey from his office to the inauguration ceremony, Putin travelled in a new Russian-made limousine. From now on, the limousine will replace the fleet of imported vehicles Putin uses, state television reported.

'Shooting gallery' helps addicts in Europe's richest country

LUXEMBOURG: Far from the glitzy bank buildings and boutiques in Luxembourg city sits a run-down prefab building behind the railway station that shows another side to Europe's richest country. The tiny grand duchy nestled between France, Belgium and Germany has for more than 10 years played host to a busy "shooting gallery" to give drug addicts a safe space to inject narcotics."Here in Luxembourg there are around 2,000 users of hard drugs. For a country with 600,000 people, that's a lot," says Patrick Klein, director of the Abrigado "shooting gallery". Abrigado-which means "sheltered" in Portuguese, a nod to the fact that the historic home of Luxembourg's largest immigrant community is nearby-opened in 2005. It now boasts a consumption room, a day centre with a medical service, and a night shelter with 42 beds. The money to run it comes from a 2.7 million euro a year budget financed by the Luxembourg health ministry and the city of Luxembourg.

Troubles ahead

Opinion polls show Putin has high levels of support among Russian citizens, and Navalny has not been able to inspire a nationwide upsurge of protests. But the Russian economy is a potential weakness for Putin. Buffeted by lower oil prices, falls in the rouble, inflation

and the impact of sanctions, average monthly wages have fallen from the equivalent of \$867 in 2013 to \$553 last year.

Russia's economy, the world's eleventh largest, returned to growth of 1.5 percent last year, helped by a recovery in oil prices. But that fell far short of the growth Russians grew accustomed to earlier in Putin's rule. Putin, first elected president in 2000, will soon have ruled longer than Soviet Communist leader Leonid Brezhnev, whose 18-year rule from 1964 to 1982 is primarily associated with stagnation. By the time his term ends, Putin will be 71. Foreign diplomats and analysts say uncertainty over what happens after 2024 is likely to destabilize the ruling elite and spark infighting among rival Kremlin clans.—Reuters

'Nazi grandma' skips jail

BERLIN: German police are hunting an 89-year-old grandmother convicted on several occasions for Holocaust denial, after she failed to turn herself in to serve her prison sentence. Ursula Haverbeck, dubbed "Nazi-Oma" (Nazi grandma) by German media, was convicted in October on eight counts of incitement and sentenced to two years in prison. But she did not report to prison to serve her sentence by the April 23 deadline. "After the convict failed to report to the relevant penal institution within the deadline, prosecutors in Verden on May 4, 2018 issued an order to execute the sentence and have charged police with its implementation," prosecutors said in a statement. —AFP

13 dead, 150 hospitalized

PHNOM PENH: At least 13 people have died and nearly 150 have been hospitalized in central Cambodia after drinking contaminated liquid, health officials said yesterday, blaming either home brewed rice wine or water. The deaths began on May 3, rocking two villages in the poor, rural Chet Borey district of Kratie province. "As of today (Monday) 13 people have died," Chheang Savutha, provincial health director, said. "We don't know what cause is of the incident yet, we are working on that now," he added. —AFP

IS claims assassination

BAGHDAD: Gunmen shot dead a parliamentary candidate at his home in northern Iraq yesterday, a local official said, in an attack claimed by the Islamic State group. The candidate was "shot dead" by armed men at dawn "after they forced their way into his home," said Salah Al-Juburi, a local official in Qayyarah, 70km south of Mosul city. The official named the slain candidate as Faruq Zarzur Al-Juburi, 45, a Sunni from Shiite Vice President Ayad Allawi's National Alliance list. National elections are set to take place in the Shiite majority country on Saturday. In a statement on the messaging app Telegram, IS said Zarzur al-Juburi was killed because he was "an atheist". —AFP

Hawaii residents warned

PAHOA: Emergency authorities battling lava flows and gas erupting from Hawaii's Kilauea volcano told some residents to "Go now" as a new fissure opened and more structures were destroyed. Kilauea has destroyed 26 homes and forced 1,700 people to leave their residences since it erupted on Thursday, spewing lava and toxic gas from volcanic vents in a small area of Hawaii's Big Island. A new fissure opened on Sunday night in the Leilani Estates area some 12 miles from the volcano, prompting a cellphone alert for residents to leave homes to avoid sulfur dioxide gas, which can be life threatening at high levels. —Reuters

Trial resumes in Turkey

ALIAGA: The trial of an American pastor that has strained relations between Turkey and the US resumed yesterday, with the defendant again rejecting charges of links to terror groups. Andrew Brunson, head of a small Protestant church in the western city of Izmir, faces up to 35 years in jail if he is convicted. He has been held in detention since October 2016.—AFP

Mud-slinging and sabotage; Malaysia gears up for polls

KUALA LUMPUR: Vicious mud-slinging, allegations of voter fraud and sabotage have marred a hard-fought campaign for Malaysian elections tomorrow, in which scandal-plagued Prime Minister Najib Razak will take on a heavyweight ex-leader. Najib's ruling coalition has governed Malaysia since independence from Britain in 1957 but is facing a tough test at the polls due to a challenge from a former insider-veteran ex-premier Mahathir Mohamad-and the 1MDB financial scandal. The government is expected to win, partly helped by a healthy economy, however critics say gerrymandering and electoral abuses have also been used to tip the scales in Najib's favour.

But the surprise return of 92-year-old Mahathir at the head of an alliance filled with parties he crushed during two decades in ower has shaken up the race, giving the opposition a charismatic standard-bearer they hope can topple Najib. "This is the most unpredictable general election in Malaysia for years," Yang Razali Kassim, a Malaysia expert from the S.Rajaratnam School of International Studies of Nanyang Technological University in Singapore said. "Mahathir's comeback has been a game-changer. It reversed the political fortunes of the opposition and shook up the entire political landscape". The high stakes have prompted a brutal campaign, in which Najib and Mahathir have relentlessly hurled insults at each other as they raced up and down the country for rallies. Mahathir has run down Najib, his one-time protege, lambasting him over 1MDB, and taking aim at his wife Rosmah Mansor, whose reportedly spendthrift habits have made her unpopular. Billions of dollars were allegedly looted from 1MDB, set up by Najib, in a sophisticated money-laundering scheme. The leader and 1MDB deny any wrongdoing. Najib has hit back, criticizing Mahathir's authoritarian track record when in office.

'Too much corruption'

As the battle heated up, authorities have increasingly taken aim at the opposition. Police have started a probe into Mahathir for allegedly breaking a controversial new law against "fake news" after he claimed that a plane he chartered was sabotaged. Civil society groups have raised the alarm about what they say are attempts by the ruling Barisan Nasional (BN) coalition to cheat, including allegations that millions of voters without addresses, as well as dead people, have appeared on the electoral roll.

Critics say one of the clearest attempts to rig the poll came in March when the BN-dominated parliament voted to redraw the electoral map, creating new constituencies dominated by the Muslim Malay majority, who traditionally back the government. Najib's party has been accused of running a racially-charged campaign to shore up the support of the Malays, who make up some 60 percent of the population in the multi-ethnic country. Italian parties still far apart; election re-run looming

ROME: The prospect of an election re-run in Italy grew yesterday as President Sergio Mattarella held a final round of consultations to try to break two months of political deadlock with party leaders still far apart. The head of the far-right League, Matteo Salvini, said he had asked Mattarella to give him a mandate to try to form a government as chief of a centre-right alliance that won the most seats at the inconclusive March 4 election.

"We trust that the president will give us the chance to find a majority in parliament," Salvini said after seeing Mattarella. However, the centre-right is some 50 seats short of majority and a source in the president's office said that without a clear political deal, Mattarella is more likely to try to form a neutral government acceptable to a broad range of parties. But it was far from certain whether such an administration could win a vote of confidence needed to get off the ground. Both the League and the anti-establishment 5-Star Movement, Italy's single largest party, have been hostile to the idea.

With a mesh of seemingly rigid vetoes still in place, the presidential source said there was a growing possibility that a repeat election could be held as early as July, when many Italians will have already left for their summer holidays. This would be unprecedented in Italy, where in the post-war period elections have always been held in the spring. 5-Star leader Luigi Di Maio said after meeting Mattarella that he had reiterated his offer to form a government with the League, by which the two parties would jointly decide on a mutually acceptable prime minister. —Reuters

In Turkey's Kurdish heartland, a battle for homes and votes

Turkey to hold snap elections in June

DIYARBAKIR: Kurdish electrician Sukru Gunduz was out on a job when a friend came running to tell him his house was being knocked down, with five members of his family inside. Angry and alarmed, he rushed home. By the time he got there, a mechanical digger had smashed a hole in the small house in the historic Sur district of Divarbakir, the biggest city in predominantly Kurdish southeastern Turkey.

Gunduz's mother, his wife and three of their five children were inside but no one was hurt and he persuaded the demolition workers to stop. But it was only a brief reprieve: two weeks later, at the start of this year, the two-storey structure was torn down in line with a state expropriation order. The house was one of thousands razed under a state urban renewal program intended also to relocate residents from areas devastated after a decades-old conflict between government forces and Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) militants resumed in 2015.

The government hopes the program will boost the economy and win President Tayyip Erdogan and the ruling AK Party some goodwill-and votes-as they prepare for snap presidential and parliamentary elections on June 24. But Gunduz and three others interviewed by Reuters whose homes were demolished say they are awaiting compensation. The 47-year-old electrician has also lost part of his livelihood: the ground floor of his house was his electrical shop and a grocery store. "I haven't sold the house, received money or signed anything. What right do you have to demolish my house?" Gunduz, 47, said in the courtyard of a house in Sur where he and his family are staying.

Two government officials in Ankara declined to comment on the redevelopment issue. But Urbanisation Minister Mehmet Ozhaseki said in

March the government would provide housing for all those left homeless by the destruction in Sur, one of seven areas of southeast Turkey that are being redeveloped. "We will give houses to all our brothers whose homes have been destroyed. Our levels of agreement are around 80 percent. When houses for the remaining 20 percent have been built and handed over, we will have dressed the wounds," he told a crowd in Sur when Erdogan visited to launch the construction of new homes.

Hundreds of thousands in southeast Turkev have been displaced by clashes between Turkish security forces and the PKK,

which began its separatist insurgency in 1984, and more than 40,000 people have been killed in its conflict with the Turkish state. The PKK is designated a terrorist organization by Turkey, the United States and the European Union. A group set up to support those displaced in Sur says more

than 700 people have opened court cases to challenge the expropriation and settlement terms for their homes, among some 4,000 properties demolished in the process.

The top administrative court rejected the challenges to the expropriations, citing the need to redevelop areas damaged by conflict and on the grounds that affected buildings presented a risk to locals and did not respect the area's cultural heritage. Homeowners say they have been offered only small

improvements in the sums the state offers for their properties. Appeals over the expropriation have also been made to Turkey's constitutional court. The constitutional court has not yet put these appeals on its agenda and it is unclear when it will do so, according to a court official who declined further comment.

Snap elections

Erdogan's announcement of snap elections has caught the opposition off guard and will complete Turkey's switch from a parliamentary to a presidential system. But the opposition pro-Kurdish Peoples'

Democratic Party (HDP) is dominant in southeastern Turkey and won a large share of votes there in a parliamentary election in 2015. In the clashes between Turkish security forces and the PKK, Sur witnessed some of the heaviest fighting in the conflict, and violence has picked up in the southeast since the breakdown of

"I went and saw it and liked it very much," the 34year-old tradesman said. "We are now slowly getting over it and the biggest support came from the state, materially, morally and psychologically." Despite the availability of new housing, rights group Amnesty International says many of the 25,000 displaced residents, around half the district's former population, had expressed a desire to return to Sur. The AKP disputes this, saying the vast majority of people who have been displaced have agreed on compensation. "People will move to a more modern life than in those ramshackle, run-down, derelict houses," Serdar Budak, the head of the AKP in Diyarbakir, told Reuters.

'Old spirit has gone'

The HDP says Erdogan cannot count on winning votes from the urban renewal program. "They are calculating that they can turn this into votes in the elections," said Mustafa Akengin, the HDP's deputy head for Diyarbakir province. "They won't be able to succeed in that in the region. The elections will show that." People who have lost homes receive monthly rental support of 1,000 lira (\$236), and the state has paid out 96 million lira in such support, the provincial governor said in April. Like the other Sur residents interviewed by Reuters, carpet seller Hasan Yilmaz, 53, did not disclose how he planned to vote in the snap elections. His preoccupation is with how more has been lost than buildings. "There was deep solidarity, coordination and social activity among the people who lived there," he said in his carpet store in Sur. "That old spirit has gone." —Reuters

Pakistan's interior minister recovering after gun attack

LAHORE: Pakistan's interior minister was recovering in hospital vesterday after being shot in a suspected assassination attempt possibly linked to blasphemy, with the attack seen as an ominous sign for security ahead of nationwide elections. Ahsan Iqbal, 59, was shot in the right arm as he prepared to leave a public meeting in his constituency in Punjab province late

analysts warned that a dangerous precedent had been set in which fringe groups could bend the state to their will by citing blasphemy, a highly inflammatory charge in the conservative Muslim country. Iqbal, a champion of Pakistan's much-persecuted religious minorities who has condemned hate speech against them, pushed for a negotiated settlement to the controversy.

Police said they were investigating links between Hussain and the controversy, including the small Islamist party at the centre of it. After the shooting Iqbal was airlifted to Lahore. Doctors performed surgery on him until the early hours, Shafqat Waseem Chaudhry, one of the five-mem-

Over 30 Syria forces killed

BEIRUT: More than 30 Syrian government troops have been killed in a southern district of the capital in a fierce counter-offensive by Islamic State group fighters, a monitor said yesterday. Regime forces are seeking to end IS's years-long foothold in the Palestinian camp of Yarmuk and neighboring district of Hajar Al-Aswad, both in southern Damascus. Last week, troops managed to sever a route linking the two areas, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights monitor said, but IS launched a fightback at the weekend and successfully reopened it.

"Their hit-and-run operations have continued since then, killing a total of 31 regime forces,

mostly in ambushes," said Rami Abdel Rahman, head of the Britain-based Observatory. "The regime has since been advancing slowly, taking some positions and buildings, but there hasn't been any strategic advance since Saturday," he told AFP. Regime troops control 60 percent of Hajar al-Aswad, while IS still holds more than 80 percent of Yarmuk.


Forces loyal to President Bashar Al-Assad were pounding both districts with air strikes and shelling yesterday, Abdel Rahman said. Since the start of the offensive in mid-April, more than 150 regime forces have been killed, as well as 120 IS fighters, the Observatory said. Another 47 civilians also died in the fighting. Yarmuk was once a thriving Palestinian camp that was home to around 160,000 people but only a few hundred are expected to still remain. Syria's government besieged the camp in 2012, and IS overran large swathes of it three years later. —AFP

Reps in key races turn down volume on Trump tax cuts

Right after Republicans in the US Senate passed their income tax overhaul in December, delivering tax cuts to businesses and most American taxpayers, Senate Republican leader Mitch McConnell was buoyant. Surrounded by jubilant fellow Republicans, he told reporters, "If we can't sell this to the American people, we ought to go into another line of work." Four months later, McConnell's attempt at levity could prove prophetic.

The most vulnerable Republican incumbents in the tightest congressional races in the November elections are talking less and less about the tax cuts on Twitter and Facebook, on their campaign and congressional websites and in digital ads, the vital tools of a modern election campaign, a Reuters analysis of their online utterances shows. All told, the number of tax messages has fallen by 44 percent since January. For several congressmen in tough reelection fights, Steve Knight in California, Jason Lewis in Minnesota, and Don Bacon in Nebraska, messaging is down much more - as much as 72 percent.

Right after the tax law passed, lawmakers piggybacked on a surge of corporate announcements of tax-cut fueled bonuses to employees, wage hikes and job creation plans to tout the benefits of the bill to voters. As those corporate announcements trailed off in March and April, so did Republican politicians' messages about tax relief, the Reuters review found. With the exception of a flurry of news releases on or around April 17, when federal tax returns were due, few incumbents kept up the pace. The Reuters review did not capture candidates' email, direct mail or private conversations with donors or voters or stump speeches.

Most of the 13 Republican incumbents in the most competitive reelection bids, and their aides, declined to answer Reuters' questions on why they were communicating less online about the tax cuts. But a Reuters/Ipsos poll conducted from March 14 to 29 found that just 3 percent of American adults were aware of receiving a material benefit from the Republican legislation. Ford O'Connell, a Republican strategist, said that is why his party's candidates need to energize voters by talking about other

broad European military strategy involving Britain after Brexit has started to take shape with France at its center, often in negotiations far from the Brussels spotlight and, in one top-level EU meeting, without the UK defense minister. Despite an impasse over how to start formal negotiations with Britain on a new defense and security relationship, France is pushing a two-track approach that it discussed at a weekend gathering of EU defense ministers in the Bulgarian capital Sofia on May 5, even though Britain's Gavin Williamson did not attend.

France supports a bigger role for Spain in EU military missions to fill the hole Britain will leave, while it will offer London a place in a new French-led European "intervention force" to keep Britain close in military cooperation.

Meanwhile, a group of Britain's close in mintary cooperation. Meanwhile, a group of Britain's closest EU allies, led by the Netherlands and Belgium, signed a paper in Sofia pressing for London's swift inclusion in the bloc's new flagship defense pact, agreed in December. That would allow British industry into lucrative EU military projects, albeit on a selective basis. Spain and Estonia said they also want to see Britain in the Galileo satellite program that the EU is developing to rival the US Global Positioning System, despite rules that prohibit sharing sensitive information with non-EU states. tionship between the EU and Britain have not yet started, despite British Prime Minister Theresa May's call for a defense and security treaty by 2019. Britain will leave the EU on March 29, 2019. EU officials say Britain must still come forward with a detailed proposal to the European Commission's Brexit negotiator Michel Barnier, while London says it has already presented a position paper and wants to get on with working out a deal. "A future security agreement sounds logical, as nobody wants a dark space in European territory that militants could exploit," said one



EU govts seen more flexible than EU fund. It also wants a role in the European Defense Agency, which helps EU governments to develop weapons.

The European Commission has stressed the bloc's status as a members-only club, seeing Britain as a third-party outsider. EU capitals are eager to come to a better arrangement. "There are a lot of ideas on the table and it's now up to EU governments to find a solution," Estonia's Defence Minister Juri Luik told Reuters, saying "hardnosed defense" was always about coordination between states. But it is the Commission which will negotiate with London.

Enter France, Spain

France, for one, is not waiting. Spain sees an opportunity. Madrid has Paris' backing to take over Britain's command of an EU maritime mission off the Horn of Africa, known as Atalanta, and to run it from its Rota naval base in southern Spain. France's naval base at Brest would also be involved. "Ours is very rigorous proposal with a fundamental guarantee because Spain is the only country with an uninterrupted presence in Atalanta," said Cospedal, who discussed the issue with her French counterpart Florence Parly in Sofia. Italy is also vying for command of Atalanta. EU governments are set to decide in June. At Rota, Spain also hopes to host one of the European Union's five military "operational headquarters", replacing Britain's Northwood base outside London. France, Germany, Italy and Greece host the other four. French President Emmanuel Macron next month hopes to agree a 10-nation coalition, including Britain, called the European Intervention Initiative. Paris says it would be a more agile, decisive force than the existing EU battlegroups, which have never been used. Representing Britain at the Sofia talks, junior defense minister Frederick Curzon said involvement in the force would help London's search for a "deep and special partnership" in defense and security. —Reuters

Jesse Huni, a spokesman for the National Republican Congressional Committee, acknowledged there "has been a downtick in what voters are hearing from members and businesses on the tax reform front." He said it was because lawmakers had moved on to other issues. "Candidates and members need to make sure that they stay focused on what is our signature achievement in this Congress," Hunt said.

Five of the 13 candidates who did respond to Reuters said they do talk regularly to voters at events. The Republican tax law sharply cut the corporate tax rate, encouraged corporations to repatriate overseas income at lower rates, and at least temporarily, cut taxes for the wealthy and most other Americans. Many of the benefits to individuals won't become obvious until they file their tax returns in early 2019, and that is long after the congressional elections.

Koch spending

The election cycle is still in its early stage, so the volume of talk on the tax overhaul could always increase. And even if politicians are reluctant to tout it, conservative financial supporters are showing an eagerness to fill the gap. Billionaires Charles and David Koch are spending \$20 million to promote the benefits of the tax cuts in battleground states with digital ads and even door-to-door canvassing.

Some polling results suggest that taxes are not the burning issue for voters that Republicans hoped they would be. A Quinnipiac University poll in March said only 8 percent of voters thought taxes was the most important issue in deciding how to vote in the congressional elections. It was fifth, behind healthcare, the economy, gun policy and immigration. It is also harder for Republicans to talk about lower taxes in states with high local taxes like New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania and Virginia. That also happens to be where 10 of the 17 most competitive congressional races are.

Many taxpayers in those states will pay more in federal taxes because the new law reduces the deduction for state and local tax payments. About one in four Americans expect their state and local income taxes to rise because of the Republican tax law, while only 11 percent expect them to fall, according to a recent Reuters/Ipsos poll.

What they do say

Barbara Comstock, locked in a tight race for reelection in Virginia's 10th Congressional District, says she talks about the tax overhaul at campaign events. The Reuters analysis shows that though she mentioned the benefits of the tax cuts 36 times in January in social media, she did so only 13 times in March and then 22 times in April. She said in an interview that she is reacting to constituents, whose interests have moved on to other issues.

Don Bacon, of Nebraska's 2nd district, sees economic growth, and the threats posed by North Korea and Islamic State as the election-winning issues for Republicans. "Taxes will be one of the pillars of our campaign, but more indirectly. In the end, it's going to be about an economy that's growing."

Republican Mike Coffman, whose reelection prospects are rated a toss-up in his Denver-area congressional district, has not been visible at all on taxes via social media. But his campaign spokesman, Tyler Sandberg, said Coffman talks about tax cuts regularly with supporters via email and with small business owners. When they do talk about taxes, Republic candidates prefer to talk about the tax law in the context of how it is really a form of financial assistance to help families cope with college tuition, buy new cars, make mortgage payments, or even pay for summer camp. —Reuters

"We must avoid a rupture (with Britain)," Spain's Defense Minister Maria Dolores de Cospedal told Reuters. Her counterpart, Sweden's Peter Hultqvist, had a similar message: "It is important that Britain is involved in Europe's future security cooperation." Such support reflects a recognition that the EU cannot defend itself from Russian and militant threats without Britain, which with France is Europe's biggest security power. For its part, Britain would become more vulnerable without continued access to EU intelligence and databases.

enied asylum and put on deportation notice, Iranian seamstress Masoumeh Bayat in February became one of Germany's Geduldete - "tolerated persons". The German government acknowledges Bayat, her husband and two daughters can't return to Iran where they could face reprisal for converting from Islam to Christianity. But the three-year permit that allowed her to work at the Fahnen Koessinger textile factory has been revoked.

"What happened to Bayat shows the idiocy of the system," said Florian Englmaier, owner of the firm in the southern Bavarian town of Schierling, who hired her in Sept 2016. "They don't let her work, they can't deport her to Iran, and so they make her a burden on the welfare system," he said. An order for a major client was delayed by her departure, he said, and he has still not found a replacement.

It's a big source of frustration for the hundreds of smalland medium-sized "Mittelstand" companies that eagerly hired asylum seekers in the midst of a labor shortage, only to see their work permits revoked. A record 1.2 million jobs remain unfilled in Germany, the Federal Labor Office says. "We need security for refugee workers so that we can plan long-term," Englmaier said.

Faced with cases like Englmaier's, business leaders are pushing the government to reform a system that leaves decisions over the fate of the Geduldete to Germany's 16 states, with inconsistent outcomes that often seem arbitrary. Their efforts could be foiled by politics, however. After losses to a far-right anti-immigrant party in last September's election, Chancellor Angela Merkel's conservatives and their center-left Social Democrat (SPD) coalition partners can ill afford further liberalizing immigration policies that are already seen by many voters as overly generous.

A two-pronged approach is taking shape, according to a federal government official who spoke to Reuters on condition of anonymity: lenient rules for migrants who are already in Germany in exchange for tougher rules for ones who come in the future. "All refugees who are either studying, have qualifications, or are in preparatory voca-

Part of the sensitivity stems from Britain's years of blocking EU defence cooperation, fearing an EU army, as well as EU rules that restrict access for non-EU states to European Union bodies such as police agency Europol. "This would bring to an end the burdensome tug of war over the right to stay for many refugees who have integrated well and want to earn a living," he said.

In limbo

Some 1.6 million people have come to Germany seeking asylum since 2014, mostly from the Middle East and Africa. Of these, more than 166,000 people are now in limbo: Their applications for asylum have been rejected but they cannot be deported because they have no identification documents, their home countries refuse to accept them back, or there is founded fear for their safety once home. The number of these "tolerated persons" is expected to grow as Germany has been rejecting more asylum applications. About 25 percent of asylum decisions were rejected in 2016, government figures show. That figure rose to 38.5 percent last year.

According to rules introduced after the influx of migrants peaked in 2015, asylum seekers can apply to work three months from the date of their arrival while they wait for a decision on their asylum, a process that takes seven months on average. Their work permits can be taken away if they've been rejected. But in some cases, if they retain their permits, they can apply for threeyear apprenticeships that include language training as well as work experience followed by another two years to look for work.

The problem is the three most populous German states, which have absorbed nearly half of the new arrivals, have different positions on the issue, according to business leaders, migration experts and the government official. Baden-Wuerttemberg in the southwest and North Rhine-Westphalia on the Dutch border are showing leniency. But Bavaria, where the anti-immigrant Alternative for Germany (AfD) is expected to enter regional parliament for the first time in elections in October, is taking a tough line.

"This is a big and growing problem," said Thomas Liebig, a migration expert at the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). "The longer those people stay here the more difficult it will be to return them. Their prospects of finding work will also decrease. Pressure to find a solution for them will rise."

The government has said it plans to set up a commission to recommend how integration and immigration policies can be improved. The government official, who is familiar with the efforts but asked not to be named because the commission's mandate has not yet been agreed, said it would seek to address the inconsistencies.

Merkel's Christian Democrats (CDU), their Christian Social Union (CSU) allies in Bavaria and the SPD were unlikely to go as far as declaring a general amnesty, the official said. But they could agree an amnesty for failed asylum seekers who have made an effort to integrate through language learning or who could work, the official said. It would only apply to those who arrived in Germany before a certain deadline. "No-one has an interest in an amnesty that comes without strings attached for migrants," the government official said.

Language and residency

Experts say reforms should facilitate language study and establish permanent residency status for those who qualify. That would appeal to companies which have said in surveys that knowledge of German and secure residency status are the two most important factors in hiring. "The initial reaction when the refugees arrived was very positive. Companies thought: we are looking for young people and those people are mainly young. Perfect!'," said Andreas Oehme, managing director of the West German Skilled Crafts Chambers, which represents the sector employing most refugees. "Then there was a phase of frustration: 'Oh! They don't speak German, they need training'. Today the approach is more realistic. Companies know the refugees are no solution to their labor shortages but they think they could make a contribution."

The situation would be different for new arrivals. The coalition partners want to set up centers where newly arrived asylum seekers would be held for up to 18 months until a decision on their application is made. Interior Minister Horst Seehofer of the arch-conservative CSU, which is based in Bavaria, has vowed to use the centers to increase deportations. Some 24,000 people were deported last year, 5.6 percent less than in 2016.

"With regards to the centers, one of the overarching goals would be deportations in order to send a message to newcomers that the rules have changed," said Julian Lehmann of the Global Public Policy Institute in Berlin. Speaking to Reuters on her old factory floor, Bayat said she hoped an amnesty can be agreed that will apply to her family. "The whole situation makes me very sad," she said, wiping tears away with one hand while she held her deportation order in the other. Around her, her former colleagues embroidered banners for churches and unions. "I just want to work, rent a bigger flat, buy a car, take the kids on holiday." —Reuters

Nabih Berri, who heads the Shiite party Amal and was allied with Hezbollah, looks certain to keep the position of speaker he has held since 1992. And the Lebanese Forces party of former warlord Samir Geagea were set to score significant gains, with a projected 15 seats. Despite the disappointing turnout among an electorate that included around 800,000 people who were too young to vote in the previous general polls, the new electoral law that allows smaller parties to run helped a civil society list break into parliament. 



Expansion Knights sink Sharks to reach Conference finals

Tampa Bay punch their ticket to Eastern Conference final

LOS ANGELES: Marc-Andre Fleury stopped 28 shots for his fourth shutout of the postseason as the expansion Vegas Golden Knights advanced to the Western Conference final with a 3-0 win over the San Jose Sharks on Sunday.

It is another stunning development in the evolution of the NHL's newest franchise as the Golden Knights are off to the league semi-finals after eliminating the more experienced and playoff battle-tested Sharks in six games.

"I got lucky a few times. They missed the net, they hit the post," said Fleury, who won three Stanley Cups with the Pittsburgh Penguins. "I am a little bit tired. They made it tough for me. I am happy and proud of the way our guys played tonight."

The Golden Knights started the year as a team of rag-tag castoffs but quickly jelled into the hardest working team in the league that allowed them to get into playoff mode by mid-season. Jonathan Marchessault, Nate Schmidt and Cody Eakin scored goals for Vegas, who became the third team in NHL history to win multiple playoff series in its inaugural season, joining the Toronto Arenas (1918) and St. Louis Blues (1968).

The Arenas won the Stanley Cup in the first post-season in league history and St. Louis won two rounds to win the all-expansion West Division 50 years ago. Marchessault opened the scoring, Schmidt added an insurance goal that was only detectable by video replay and Eakin scored into an empty net.

Fleury recorded shutouts in games one and six against the Sharks. Next up for Vegas will be the Western Conference final against either Winnipeg or Nashville. The Jets lead that series 3-2 heading into game six later.

In Tampa, Florida, J.T. Miller scored the go-ahead goal on the power play and the Tampa Bay Lightning punched their ticket to the Eastern Conference final with a 3-1 victory over Boston. After dropping the series opener 6-2, the Lightning won four straight to eliminate the Bruins in five games in the best-of-seven second-round series.

Miller scored at 14:00 of the second period for the Lightning, who reached the NHL's final four for the third time in four years. Tampa Bay move on to play the winner

of the Pittsburgh Penguins-Washington Capitals series. The Capitals lead the Penguins 3-2 and can book their spot in the Conference final later today.

Brayden Point, with his fourth of the post-season, and Anton Stralman also scored for the Lightning while goalkeeper Andrei Vasilevskiy made 27 saves. Bruins goaltender Tuukka Rask made 19 saves but ended up losing his last four starts against Tampa

MUMBAI: Perennial slow starters Mumbai Indians are on course for a trademark late-season charge into the Indian Premier League (IPL) playoffs, thanks largely to some impressive performances by all-rounder Hardik Pandya. The defending champions, owned by India's richest man Mukesh Ambani, lost their first five matches but still reached the 2014 playoffs before completing a fairytale tournament victory a year later after losing their opening four fixtures. The 2016 edition saw the Rohit Sharma-led side win one out of their first four matches before they appeared to shed the tardy-starter tag last season, going on to win their third IPL title after 10 wins in 14 group stage games. The lack of victories at the start of the campaign returned to haunt them again this season as Mumbai lost five of their opening six games, appearing doomed to miss out on the playoffs as their title defence faltered. They have, however, managed to arrest the slide with three wins in four matches as Pandva's all-round abilities came to the fore in his side's turnaround. Pandya stole the show in Mumbai's 13-run win over the Kolkata Knight Riders on Sunday with an unbeaten 35 off 20 balls and then dented the opposition's seemingly comfortable chase with figures of two for 19. We have done it in the past though obviously it's difficult," Pandya said at the post-match press conference when asked if his team can once again go all the way. "I don't like anything which comes easy. I like difficult things. This is a challenge and I will love to take it." — Reuters

Park wins storm-shortened LPGA Texas Classic

CHICAGO: Reigning US Women's Open champion Park Sung-hyun of South Korea chipped in for birdie on the final hole Sunday to edge fast-closing Lindy Duncan and win the storm-shortened LPGA Texas Classic.

Park fired a five-under par 66 to finish the 36-hole event at 11-under 131 at Old American Golf Club near Dallas for a one-stroke victory over American Duncan with Chinese rookie Liu Yu another shot adrift in third on 133.

Park's pitching wedge chip-in at the 18th hole provided her margin of victory over Duncan, who closed with three birdies in a row after Park was in the clubhouse, and Liu, who like Duncan had a career-best LPGA finish.

"I knew it was a pretty important shot," Park said through a translator. "That shot was a difficult situation for me but I'm glad I made it." It was the third LPGA title for Park, who captured her first major crown last July in the Open at Trump National and added the Canadian Women's Open six weeks later.

Thailand's Ariya Jutanugarn and South Korea Kim Sei-young shared fourth with South Korean Jenny Shin and India's Aditi Ashok on 135. Storms that wiped out almost all play Thursday and Friday forced organizers to trim the event to 36 holes, with the final round starting Saturday afternoon.

Ashok, seeking her first LPGA title, birdied the par-5 15th on a five-foot putt and closed with three pars. The 20-year-old Olympian from Bangalore, three times a winner on the Ladies European Tour, completed a 66 to grab the early clubhouse lead.

"I'm happy," Ashok said. "I came back one better than I left so that's good." But 18-hole co-leader Park had yet to start her final round after opening on 65 and

made her charge in the afternoon.

Park opened with a bogey but eagled the par-5 fifth and followed with birdies at the sixth, eighth and ninth before a bogey-birdie start to the back nine left her ahead by three with seven holes remaining.

After six pars, Park was off the green with her approach at 18 but punched a bouncing pitching wedge shot up the green and into the hole for a closing birdie that all-but sealed the title. Duncan, finishing on the front nine, fired a 64 that included a costly lip-out tapin for par to bogey the sixth. She closed with three consecutive birdies but was one shot shy of Park, settling for a career-best runner-up finish.

"It sure did feel like a back-nine Sunday atmosphere," Duncan said. "It was a great day. A crazy week but it was a great tournament." Liu eagled the eighth, her penultimate hole, but like Duncan couldn't make an unlikely hole-out from the fairway to match Park.

"This was a great confidence booster for myself to know I can contend out here," Liu said. "I was mentally strong, focused on one shot at a time, and it really worked out." — AFP one half-century but since his 199 against England at the end of 2016, Rahul has scored nine more fifties without adding another ton.

(I wanted to) try to bat deep in the innings and that was the plan and I am very happy that it paid off today." —Reuters

Justify takes aim at Preakness crown

WASHINGTON: Undefeated Kentucky Derby winner Justify will race in the second leg of US flat racing's Triple Crown at the Preakness in two weeks, trainer Bob Baffert said Sunday. Baffert said the three-year-old colt had abundant energy the morning after defeating Good Magic by 2 1/2 lengths to conquer a 20-horse field over 1 1/4 miles on a muddy Churchill Downs track.

"He looks phenomenal," Baffert said. "He's full of himself. He knows he's a stud. He came back and he really wasn't that tired. "He ate up last night and today he has been a handful. When I got him out of the stall he was pulling me around. Usually they are a little bit tired."

Justify, who has won all four of his starts, is expected to arrive three or four days before the second leg of the Triple Crown is contested over 1 3/16 miles on May 19 at Pimlico in Baltimore, Maryland. The third race of the treble is June 9 at the Belmont Stakes in New York. Only 12 horses have won all three races in the same year, the most recent being Baffert-trained American Pharoah in 2015.

Justify became only the second horse to win the Derby after not racing as a two-year-old, the other being Apollo in 1882. Baffert has trained five Derby winners, one shy of the all-time record, and no Derby winner of his who has raced the Preakness has failed to win it.

The fact Justify was still frisky to run after the sixthfastest opening quarter-mile in Derby history at 22.24 seconds and a muddy race spoke volumes to Baffert in terms of winning style and what the future might bring.—AFP

Maxwel Cornet replaced Nabil Fekir, who has been strongly linked with a move to Liverpool, late on and grabbed a third goal with two minutes left as Lyon stayed in second place and on track to secure automatic qualification for the Champions League. "Nothing is decided for the time being," Lyon coach Bruno Genesio said. "It will be tight until the finish and

Man Utd's Jones hopeful of full recovery for legend Ferguson

The sudden, irresistable rise of Istanbul's Basaksehir

ISTANBUL: Istanbul Basaksehir's home stadium is sometimes only a quarter full, they have yet to win a trophy and until a few years ago were floundering in the lower ranks of Turkish football. But now the team with an unpronounceable name for non-native speakers are major contenders to be Turkish champions and upend the traditional dominance of the three Istanbul giants of Besiktas, Fenerbahce and Galatasaray.



LONDON: Manchester United defender Phil Jones is hopeful legendary former manager Alex Ferguson will make a full recovery from emergency surgery on a brain haemorrhage, despite admitting he was "devastated" by the news of his ill health.

Considered the most successful manager in the history of British football, Ferguson, 76, won 38 trophies in just over 26 years in charge of United, including 13 Premier League titles and the Champions League twice before retiring in 2013.

United have offered no update on Ferguson's condition since saying a procedure on the haemorrhage on Saturday had gone "very well", but that a period of intensive care is needed to optimise his recovery. "(I am) just devastated, absolutely devastated," said Jones, who was signed for United by Ferguson in 2011.

"He is such a legend in my eyes. He is the one who brought me to the club and gave me that opportunity to play for one of the biggest clubs in the world. He's taken me under his wing like a father and it was shocking." "It's sad, but I know his character. I know he has that fight in him. Hopefully he'll recover well." United midfielder Juan Mata also admitted news of Ferguson's condition had a "huge impact" on the current squad.

This circumstance has had a huge impact on Manchester United, as you can imagine," Mata wrote in his blog. "All of us are united right now, wishing Sir Alex a speedy recovery. He has been a unique and fundamental figure in the football world over the last few decades."

United thanked the many well-wishers, including the likes of rival managers Arsene Wenger, Pep Guardiola and Jurgen Klopp, who spoke of their admiration for Ferguson. "As well as being uppermost in the thoughts of our own players, past and present, Sir Alex has been the subject of many warm and touching comments from other clubs, governing bodies and individuals in the beautiful game," United said in a statement on Sunday.

'STRONG MAN'

Wenger enjoyed a long, and at times fractious, rivalry with Ferguson as they battled for Premier League supremacy in the first decade of the Frenchman's 22-year reign in charge of Arsenal.

However, they later became friends and with Wenger leaving Arsenal at the end of the season, Ferguson presented the his old adversary with a memento on his final visit to United's Old Trafford ground just last weekend. "I was with him on the pitch last week. I went to see him in the box after the game and he looked in a perfect shape," said Wenger, after his final home game as Arsenal boss.

"He told me he is doing a lot of exercise, and he looked very happy but that kind of accident can happen. We wish him all well and to recover very quickly. He is a strong man and an optimistic man."

Sunday saw runaway winners Manchester City receive the Premier League trophy. But local rivalries were forgotten as a banner was held aloft by City fans reading: "Football aside get well Fergie" as supporters spilled onto the pitch at full-time of a O-0 draw with Huddersfield.—AFP

For their critics, Basaksehir are an artificial invention, owing their success to political support with none of the heritage or culture of the other history-laden sides.

But their success is indisputable. After finishing runners-up last season Basaksehir remain in contention for the Super Lig title with a team boasting international names like Gael Clichy and Emmanuel Adebayor

No Istanbul side other than Besiktas, Fenerbahce and Galatasaray have ever won the Super Lig since it was created in 1959. Outside the big three, the only other winners have been Trabzonspor (six times) and Bursaspor (once).

"Basaksehir have put themselves forward and are now one of the great clubs," said Burak Bilgili, head of the Basaksehir 1453 supporters club. "Now there are four great clubs in Istanbul," he told AFP.

Basaksehir are "a club growing in power," said Frenchborn Turkish striker Mevlut Erdinc, who joined them last summer. "We want to be among the best."

The rise of Basaksehir to this level, in some ways, reads like a fairytale. They were set up in 1990 and played under the unwieldy full name of the Istanbul municipality as Istanbul Buyuksehir Belediyespor (IBB), something of a tongue twister for foreigners.

They won promotion to the Super Lig in 2007 but were then relegated in 2014 and appeared at risk of being liquidated. But then their fortunes changed dramatically when they were bought by a consortium of businessmen reputedly close to President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

The result of the acquisition was a makeover for the club, and a move to the new high-rise Istanbul suburb of Basaksehir, taking the new name.

A new 17,000 capacity stadium was built, named after the legendary Turkish former player and manager Fatih

Goal or no goal? Five **VAR controversies**

SYDNEY: Football's Video Assistant Referee (VAR) has been on trial since 2016 at both club and international level and will be employed at next month's World Cup in Russia. But some critics are calling for it to be dropped from the showpiece tournament after a string of controversial incidents. Here AFP Sport reviews five of the worst:

ON-OFF SAGA IN GERMANY

In a Mainz v Freiburg Bundesliga match last month, the hosts had a penalty appeal for handball waved away in first-half stoppage time by referee Guido Winkmann, who blew for half-time and the players headed for the changing rooms. But Winkmann was advised by the VAR to take another look and after five minutes he reversed his decision, meaning both teams had to be dragged back onto the field. The penalty was scored and the players then headed straight back off again for half-time.

FREEZING FARCE AT WEMBLEY

A catalogue of incidents during an FA Cup replay on a bitterly cold February night was a big factor in the

Terim who ironically manages league rivals Galatasaray.

Erdogan blessed the club's new look when in July 2014 he donned Basaksehir colours to play in a charity game at the new stadium in which he scored an improbable three goals in just 15 minutes.

The year 2014 also saw IBB's former manager Abdullah Avci return from a stint as national coach to lead the reborn side. Unusual in the hurly-burly of Turkish football, he has remained in his post ever since.

'NO EMPTY STANDS'

In 2015 and 2016 the club finished fourth and enjoyed its first taste of European competition. Now, they are up there with the leaders. "We are competing against clubs that are 100 years old. It's an extraordinary situation," said Avci. Top international players have made their way to Basaksehir and the side now boasts the likes of French former Arsenal and Manchester City star Clichy and Togo striker Adebayor who played for a host of English clubs. The club also scored a major coup by securing the services of Turkey's best-known player Arda Turan on a loan deal from Barcelona. And their eye for local talent was underlined when in 2016 they picked up the then unknown Turkish winger Cengiz Under. After one hugely successful season, he was then sold to Roma in a deal worth 15 million euros (\$18 million).

English Premier League opting to go without VAR next season. Tottenham welcomed minnows Rochdale to Wembley and saw what looked a perfectly good Erik Lamela goal disallowed by the VAR, Graham Scott, who was watching in a studio some 20 kilometres (12 miles) away. He then refused a penalty when Lucas Moura was felled in the box, but awarded one after the referee had given a free-kick outside the area when Kieran Trippier was fouled. Son Heung-min struck the spot-kick home but the VAR then disallowed the goal for a stuttering runup, with the coup de grace being the South Korean's subsequent yellow card for an "illegal feint". All the incidents took time to resolve with players and spectators left shivering in a sub-zero blizzard during an opening period that lasted the best part of 52 minutes. "The first half was a bit embarrassing for everyone," said Tottenham manager Mauricio Pochettino, after his side ran out 6-1 winners.

PORTUGAL'S GIANT FLAG

A Primeira Liga match in Portugal descended into farce when a giant flag obscured the view of a camera, allowing an offside goal to stand. Aves beat Boavista 3-0, with their third goal scored by a clearly offside Vitor Gomes from a 70th-minute free-kick. There was no linesman's flag but when the referee asked the VAR to check, another flag proved crucial. A Boavista fan in the away end had waved his flag at exactly the wrong moment,

But sceptics point to the patchy attendances for home matches, which rarely rise above 5,000, and a lack of passion compared to the intensity of support at the other big Istanbul clubs.

Most controversially, the club is regarded by rival fans as a government side which would have got nowhere without Erdogan's support. The club's chairman Goksel Gumusdag is married to the niece of Erdogan's wife Emine and seen as close to the Turkish president.

"Two men are behind this (Basaksehir) miracle. Manager Abdullah Avci and chairman Goksel Gumusdag," said Turkish football writer Bagis Erten. On a recent visit to Basaksehir, Erdogan said that young fans of the of the team "needed to fill the stands", adding: "If I come to a game, I don't want to see the stands empty.'

And a critical defeat by Galatasaray last month pleased not just fans of the rival team but also opponents of Erdogan who could not resist expressing schadenfreude. "Galatasaray 2 Recep Tayyip Erdogan O," tweeted Meral Aksener, who heads the nationalist Iyi (Good) Party and is standing against Erdogan in presidential elections. But Bilgili sweeps away the criticism with anger. "We began hearing this when Basaksehir started playing for the title, getting familiar with the top and threatening the big clubs," he said. "Let them continue to criticise us. In the end, we will be league champions," he said. --AFP

blocking the camera's view. With no evidence to rule out the goal, the referee had to let it stand.

ITALY'S SPOT OF LUCK

Guidelines say the VAR should only intervene if the on-field referee has missed an obvious infringement. But an incident in March, when England were leading Italy 1-O in a friendly, prompted much debate over what constitutes a "clear error". Federico Chiesa went down in the box in the 87th minute but referee Deniz Aytekin said no foul-until the VAR suggested he look again. The ref then deemed James Tarkowski had made very slight contact, but it certainly hadn't been obvious when seen at full speed. When Italy scored and secured a 1-1 draw, Gareth Southgate was not happy. "I prefer that the referee's decision is final," the England manager scowled.

THE WOBBLY LINE

Hawk-Eye apologised for using a wobbly line on a graphic to show Manchester United's Juan Mata was offside. The company said the decision, which ruled out a goal in United's 2-0 FA Cup win over Huddersfield Town in February, was correctly made using a straight line-but that an "incorrect graphic" was issued for broadcast on TV. "This was a case of the wrong image being provided to the broadcaster and we apologise," a Hawk-Eye tweet said, after the wonky yellow line prompted howls of protests by viewers. — AFP

Durant said his free form game plan allowed him to be aggressive and effective at the same time.

"I just try to tell myself that I'm at my best when I don't care what happens after the game, the outcome or anything," Durant said. "That's when I'm free and having fun out there, and forceful. I just try to play with shooting, keep being aggressive."

Stephen Curry added 23 points as the Warriors seized a 3-1 lead in their best-of-seven second-round series. The Warriors are seeking a fourth consecutive trip to the NBA finals and their third crown in four seasons.

Curry said the key was getting the ball to their hottest player, Durant. "Just find ways to get him in scoring positions," Curry said. "Sometimes, that's not really hard to do-just throw it to him. "Just keep the game simple at that point because he's such a great scorer, you don't have to really overthink things.'

The host Pelicans, led by 26 points and 12 rebounds from Anthony Davis, never led while Golden State stretched the lead to as many as 26 points. Durant added nine rebounds while Draymond Green had eight points, nine rebounds and nine assists for the Warriors. Klay Thompson added 13 points and Quinn Cook added 12 off the bench. The Warriors limited Pelicans difference makers Rajon Rondo and Nikola Mirotic to just six and seven points. New Orleans made four of 26 attempts from three-point range. Pelicans coach Alvin Gentry said they have to get more scoring from multiple players to win.

"I told you right from the start. You're not going to beat them if you can't score 115 points," Gentry said. "I don't care how good your defence is. I don't care what you do. You have to be able to score 110, 115 points to have any chance to beat them." In Utah, NBA veteran Paul, celebrating his 33rd birthday, also had 12 rebounds while James Harden scored 24 points to power the Rockets to a 3-1 series lead.

'CRAZY GAME'

"It was an emotional, crazy game," said Paul, who is in his first season with the Rockets. Clint Capela tallied 12 points, 15 rebounds and six blocks in the win. Paul powered the offence and when he combined with Harden they were impossible to defend against.

"There are different ways to win," said Rockets coach Mike D'Antoni. "We got a lot of stuff we can go to. The plan was to get that, so we wouldn't be a one dimensional team." Donovan Mitchell scored 25 points and Joe Ingles finished with 15 for Utah. — AFP

Zidane hopeful Ronaldo will be fit for Champions League final

BARCELONA: Zinedine Zidane is optimistic Cristiano Ronaldo will be fit for the Champions League final against Liverpool despite Real Madrid's star player going off injured against Barcelona on Sunday.

Ronaldo appeared to sustain a knock to his ankle as he bundled home a 14th-minute equaliser for Real at the Camp Nou. The striker played on until half-time but was substituted during the interval.

Real went on to secure a 2-2 draw without Ronaldo, as Gareth Bale struck in the 72nd minute after Lionel Messi's superb individual effort put 10-man Barca ahead. Sergi Roberto had been sent off at the end of the first period after Luis Suarez opened the scoring in a pulsating, and highly controversial, Clasico.

But Ronaldo's injury will be the key talking point, with the Portugese now facing a fight to recover in time for the Champions League final against Liverpool on May 26. "How long he will need I cannot tell you but for him, it is a small problem," Zidane said afterwards.

"We'll see tomorrow after the tests, what we have to do is see the damage done to the ankle. He is a little worried because his ankle is a bit swollen but he said it was only minor."

Ronaldo's injury, coupled with Barcelona avoiding defeat despite playing half the contest with 10 men, meant it was the Catalans who left the more satisfied.

Ernesto Valverde's men are now three matches away from becoming the first ever team to finish a 38-match La Liga season unbeaten. "It would have hurt to lose to Madrid, or any other team," Valverde said. "I think we are the only unbeaten team in Europe in the big leagues and that is something that pushes us.'

Bale's goal was his 15th in 24 games this year and the Welshman will hope it sparks a return to favour ahead of Real's European climax in Kiev.

But Bale was lucky still to be on the pitch after he stabbed his studs into the back of Samuel Umtiti's calf, moments before Sergi was sent off. It was one of a number of questionable decisions from referee Alejandro Jose Hernandez Hernandez, as both teams departed wondering what might have been. As well as Bale's reckless challenge, Suarez fouled Raphael Varane in the build-up to Messi's goal while Marcelo should have had a late penalty after he was brought down by Jordi Alba.

"Next year it will change with VAR," Zidane said. "Then we will see what a match like that will look like." Valverde added: "It was clearly a difficult match to referee. I am not sure about the red card for Sergi Roberto, he might have raised his hand but I do not think it was worthy of a red, maybe because I know him."

The thrilling nature of the match meant Andres Iniesta's last Clasico before leaving Barcelona at the end of the season was reduced to a footnote. The Spaniard went off to a standing ovation in the second half.

"I am doing everything possible so I can play these last few games and try to absorb them," Iniesta told Barca TV. "Three matches remain, they are the last ones, it seems that the end never comes but we have won the league already and I will try to enjoy every minute." — AFP

Starbucks \$7.15bn in global coffee alliance

LONDON/ZURICH: Swiss-based food giant Nestle will pay Starbucks \$7.15 billion in cash for the rights to sell the US coffee chain's products around the world, tying a premium brand to Nestle's global distribution muscle. The deal yesterday for a business with \$2 billion in sales reinforces Nestle's position as the world's biggest coffee company tries to fortify its place atop a fast-changing market.

It is a bold stroke by new Nestle Chief Executive Mark Schneider, who has made coffee a strategic priority as he tries to convince uneasy shareholders, including activist Third Point, that he can boost the sprawling group's performance. Bernstein analyst Andrew Wood said that Nestle's third-biggest acquisition would allow the Swiss company to expand the brand through its global distribution network. Nestle shares rose 1.4 percent by mid-session, having fallen by more than 8 percent so far this year. Starbucks stock was indicated 2.8 percent higher.

Seattle-based Starbucks, the world's biggest coffee chain, said it will use proceeds to speed share buybacks and the deal would add to earnings per share (EPS) by 2021 at the latest. Nestle said it expects the deal to sell Starbucks bagged coffee and drinks adding to earnings by 2019. It will not involve any of

vidual pods-as it does now with Nespresso and Nescafe-and expand sales of Starbucks soluble coffee, a key market in Asia. Starbucks now sells single-serve coffee in Kuerig K-cup pods.

The Nestle name will not appear on Starbucks products. "We do not want the consumer to perceive that Starbucks is now part of a bigger family," a Nestle source said. Starbucks, strong mostly in the United States, will have the final say on expanding its product range. "This global coffee alliance will bring the Starbucks experience to the homes of millions more around the world through the reach and reputation of Nestle," said Starbucks Chief Executive Kevin Johnson.

Nestle and Starbucks are joining forces in a highly fragmented consumer drinks category that has seen a string of deals lately. JAB Holdings, the private investment firm of Europe's billionaire Reimann family, has fueled the consolidation wave with a series of deals including Douwe Egberts, Peet's Coffee & Tea and Keurig Green Mountain, narrowing the gap with Nestle.

Richer brew

Coffee is popular with younger customers who have grown up with Starbucks. A willingness to pay up for exotic beans and specialty drinks means companies can brew up richer profit margins than in mainstream packaged food. Starbucks said it now expects to return approximately \$20 billion in cash to shareholders in share buybacks and dividends through fiscal year 2020.

It said the transaction was expected to add to earnings per share by the end of fiscal year 2021 or sooner, with no change to the company's currently stated longterm financial targets. —Reuters

Tourism accounts for nearly a tenth of global CO2 emissions

Aviation industry responsible for 2% of all human-generated CO2

BONN: Domestic and international tourism account for eight percent of greenhouse gas emissions, four times more than previously estimated, according to a study published yesterday. The multi-trillion dollar industry's carbon footprint is expanding rapidly, driven in large part by demand for energy-intensive air travel, researchers reported in the journal Nature Climate Change. "Tourism is set to grow faster than many other economic sectors," with revenue projected to swell by four percent annually through 2025, noted lead-author Arunima Malik, a researcher at The University of Sydney's business school.

Holding the sector's carbon pollution in check will likely require carbon taxes or CO2 trading schemes for aviation, the

PARIS: A month ago, President Emmanuel Macron was facing his biggest showdown with France's trade unions. It was to be his "Thatcher moment," some observers predicted, recalling a make-or-break time for Britain's prime minister in the 1980s. By taking on reforms of the debt-laden SNCF railways, Macron has thrown down the gauntlet to one of the strongest bastions of French trade unionism --- the same way Thatcher did with mining unions in 1984.

On April 3 rail workers launched the longest strike sequence ever for the network: stoppages every two days out of five until June 28. Analysts agreed that if Macron backed down as a result, the 40-year-old centrist could kiss goodbye to further ambitious reforms of the civil service and pensions.

CGT union chief Philippe Martinez said last week that as with every strike movement, "there are highs and lows". "But it has settled at a high level," he insisted. As the disruption enters its sixth cern. It hinders governments' ability to implement a strong fiscal policy response to support the economy in the event of a downturn which increases the depth and duration of recession.

Falling participation

The number of staff joining the strikes has also fallen progressively. Some 57 percent of train drivers took part in the seventh round Thursday and about 63 percent on Friday morning, down from 77 percent at the start. This has allowed SNCF managers to keep more trains running: half of high-speed TGVs ran during last week's strikes, up from one in eight at the start.

Technology

Rail users have managed to adapt to the regular strike pattern. Real-time information on phone apps, car-sharing and remote working arrangements have helped many workers avoid problems or organise their travel on non-strike days.

A BVA poll on April 25 found that for 74 percent of respondents, the stoppages had no impact on their personal life. "The strike design might have seemed innovative, but in the medium term it looks like it has gradually boomeranged," Dominique Andolfatto, a specialist in trade unions at the University of Bourgogne, told AFP.

No mass uprising

The rail strike has not spurred the wider, more powerful movement against the government to defend public services, which CGT leader Martinez has consistently called for. He had raised the idea of a re-run of the epic 1968 anti-government protests by students as well as workers, who launched a general strike in their millions which paralyzed France. But although there have been several mass protests and a handful of French universities occupied in recent months, neither students nor other public sector workers have mobilized in large enough numbers to really pressure the government. — AFP

US oil breaks through \$70, stocks firm

LONDON: Oil prices hit their highest since late 2014 yesterday, driven by a deepening economic crisis in Venezuela and worries that the Unites States could re-impose sanctions on Iran, while stocks firmed and the dollar surged to another 2018 high. With trading thinned by a holiday closure in London, European shares opened higher, boosted by energy stocks as well as encouraging earnings updates.

"It's a positive environment for the equity markets," said Niels Christensen, chief analyst at Nordea in Copenhagen. Nestle shares also gained after the Swiss-based food firm agreed to pay Starbucks \$7.15 billion in cash for the rights to sell the US coffee chain's products around the world. Most Asian markets also rose after Friday's tame reading on US wage growth lessened the chances of a pick-up in the pace of interest rate hikes by the Federal Reserve. Gains were capped by Sino-US trade tensions. US equity futures pointed to a positive open for Wall Street.

The day's eye-catching moves came in energy markets. US crude oil prices rose more than 70 cents, or 1.1 percent, pushing above \$70 a barrel for the first time since November 2014 as the crisis in OPEC member state Venezuela threatened to further crimp its production and exports. Brent crude oil futures gained to \$75.64 per barrel at 1210 GMT, up 1.14 percent and having also touched their highest since November 2014. Also driving oil prices higher was the May 12 deadline set by US President Donald Trump for Europeans to "fix" the deal with Iran over its nuclear program. If they do not, Trump has said he would refuse to extend US sanctions relief for the oil-producing Islamic Republic. Germany and France yesterday vowed to stand by the 2015 nuclear deal between Iran and world powers even if the United States pulls out. The European oil and gas share index was up 0.5 percent.

Euro at 2018 low

The dollar rose to a new 2018 peak, extending its

2-1/2 week-long rally as investors unwound short positions against the currency and bet that the relative strength of the US economy would feed through to a stronger greenback. Against a basket of currencies the dollar, which has enjoyed a sudden reversal in fortunes as investors bet on more Fed rate hikes and a slower pace of tightening in the euro zone, rose 0.4 percent to 92.968, having shrugged off Friday's weaker-than-expected jobs report.

The euro slid to below \$1.19 versus the dollar, down half a percent on the day and its weakest since Dec. 28. In data from the euro zone's largest economy Germany, industrial orders unexpectedly dropped for the third month running in March, suggesting factories there are shifting into lower gear. The week ahead includes readings on the health of the Chinese economy and, US inflation, and a Bank of England monetary policy meeting. "Looking at the US economic data, everything is looking quite positive. No one expects higher interest rates to be a brake on economic growth," said Christensen. The soft German data supported eurozone government bond markets as investors continued to bet on caution from the European Central Bank. "A lot has been repriced in terms of the ECB so the outlook for bonds is a bit more mixed," said Commerzbank rates strategist Rainer Guntermann. — Reuters

China's April FX reserves fall to 5-month low as dollar bounces

BEIJING: China's foreign exchange reserves in April fell more than expected, to a fivemonth low, as the US dollar rebounded and on growing signs that Chinese regulators are less worried about capital flight. Reserves fell \$17.97 billion in April to \$3.125 trillion - the lowest since November 2017, compared with a rise of \$8.34 billion in March, central bank data showed vesterday.

Economists polled by Reuters had forecast reserves would drop around \$10 billion in April to \$3.133 trillion, with a stronger US dollar versus other currencies expected to depress the value of China's dollar-denominated reserves. The fall in non-dollar currencies against the US dollar and correction in asset prices led to the small reserves drop in April, the State Administration of Foreign Exchange (SAFE), China's foreign exchange regulator, said. "The drop reflected almost exclusively the valuation effect of a firmer USD in April," said Andy Ji, currency strategist at Commonwealth Bank of Australia in Singapore.

"In other words, there are no signs of capital outflows at the current juncture." But Julian Evans-Pritchard at Capital Economics said he believed China's current account returned to a healthy surplus in April from a seasonal deficit in March, implying a sharp reversal in capital flows from net inflows to net outflows. "This is nothing to worry about, however. Such volatility in net cross-border flows is not uncommon at this time of year and net out-

flows look to have remained well within regulators' comfort zone," he said in a note.

The dollar index, measuring it against other major currencies, rose 2 percent last month. Capital flight was seen as a major risk for China at the start of 2017, but a combination of tighter capital controls and a faltering dollar helped the yuan stage a strong turnaround, bolstering confidence in the Chinese economy. Last year, China's reserves rose for the first time since 2014 and its cross-border capital flows went from net outflows to basically stable.

Trade disputes between China and the United States could hurt exporters on both sides and weigh on their economic growth, while adding to volatility in global financial markets. But China's foreign exchange regulator said in April that any potential impact on its cross-border capital flows stemming from Sino-US trade frictions can be controlled.

Courting capital inflows

The yuan lost around 1 percent against the resurgent greenback in April, but it is still up about 2.5 percent so far this year. Indeed, in recent weeks, Chinese authorities have announced a series of moves which suggest they are less worried about capital outflows, including allowing domestic investors to put more money into global financial markets. At the same time, China has moved to give foreign investors more access to its equity, bond and commodity futures markets, which will help support the yuan and offer greater balance to cross-border flows. The value of China's gold reserves fell to \$77.788 billion at the end of April, from \$78.419 billion at the end of March. — Reuters

Indonesia GDP growth slows in first quarter

JAKARTA: Indonesia's first-quarter GDP growth slowed on the back of a contraction in exports and public spending, the government said yesterday, despite efforts to rev up Southeast Asia's biggest economy. The latest figures present another challenge to Indonesia's President Joko Widodo who came to office in 2014 on a pledge to boost annual growth to seven percent.

But Indonesia's commodity-driven economy has been stuck in the 5.0 percent growth range despite repeated interest rate cuts by the cen-

tral bank over the past couple of years. Yesterday, Indonesia said its economy grew 5.06 percent in the January-March period, slightly off a 5.2 percent growth rate it saw in the previous three months, as lackluster consumer spending also weighed on activity. "We see little prospect of a rebound," Gareth Leather, a senior Asia economist at Londonbased consultancy Capital Economics said in a report after the data were published.

"Although the decent prospects for the global economy should help to support export volumes, subdued prices for Indonesia's main commodity exports (especially palm oil) mean revenues are likely to remain low by past standards." The country is the world's biggest producer of palm oil-used in everything from food to cosmetics. But the commodity has been facing a backlash over the environmental impact of massive land clearing to grow the crop. — AFP

LONDON: A resurgent dollar and higher borrowing costs are smashing through Argentina and Turkey's currencies like a wrecking ball and raising the likelihood more broadly that emerging markets' three-year long interest rate cutting cycle is at an end. Emerging markets came into the year flying, riding on the back of a healthy global economy and rising commodity prices alongside tame inflation and a weak dollar. It looked more than likely that a wave of rate cuts would keep rolling, allowing a bond rally to continue.

From Brazil and Russia to Armenia and Zambia, developing countries, big and small, have been on a rate cutting spree. With hundreds of rate cuts since Jan. 2015, the average emerging market borrowing cost fell under 6

percent earlier this year from over 7 percent at the time.

Fund managers' profits too have soared in this time, with emerging local currency debt among the best performing asset classes, with dollar-based returns of 14 percent last year. Even in the first quarter of 2018, returns were a buoyant 4.3 percent.

Now though, almost exactly five years since the so-called taper tantrum shook an emerging market rally, these gains appear to be on the cusp of reversal. Argentina has jacked up its interest rates to 40 percent in response to a rout in its peso currency, while Turkey was also forced into a rate rise as its lira hit record lows against the dollar. Indonesia, after heavy interventions to stem rupiah bleeding, has also

Kunam, a portfolio manager at Allianz Global Investors said, citing the increased uncertainty on monetary policy. For decades, a rising dollar has spelt bad news for emerging markets and despite all the progress in the developing world in recent years, latest price moves show not that much has changed.

With the dollar on the rise, emerging currencies have weakened some 3 percent in the past two weeks, as measured by a JPMorgan index. Figures from the Institute of International Finance this week showed that the result has been a faster exodus from EM debt than at a similar stage of the 2013 taper tantrum. At \$5.5 billion in two weeks the IIF described it as the "ghost of tantrums past". — Reuters

Global equities break losing streak in April

KUWAIT: Global equities broke their twomonth losing streak in April with the MSCI All Country World Index climbing up 0.8 percent. US equities followed suit, yet posted lower returns with the S&P 500 and Dow Jones Index each closing slightly higher, up 0.3 percent. In the US, market volatility was a major concern with a potential trade war with China brewing and an air strike on Syria. Further adding suspense to market participants was the upcoming earning season, which for the most part exceeded expectations. During the month, the US 10 year treasury broke through the 3 percent yield for the first time in almost 4 years alleviating some concerns surrounding a flattening of the yield curve which would have indicated a weaker economic position. The Federal Reserve has recently confirmed that it is on track for two additional hikes during 2018. On the economic front, the Markit Manufacturing PMI came in below the previous reading yet still above the 50 mark at 57.3. The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for Q1 annualized came in at 2.3 percent, higher than the consensus.

In Europe, the Stoxx Europe 600 posted a gain of 3.9 percent, making April the best month of 2018 so far. Unlike the US, European equities performed well during the month. Within continental Europe, three of the largest markets closed in the green. The French CAC 40 Index closed up 6.8 percent followed by the German DAX 30 Index up 4.3 percent and Spain's IBEX 35 Index up 4.0 percent. During the month, European leaders made it clear that they were willing to hit back if the US placed tariffs on euro countries. Towards the end of the month, the US did announce an extension of tariff exemptions for the euro countries avoiding any form of a cross Atlantic trade war. The Markit Manufacturing PMI for the eurozone came in flat compared to the previous month at 56.2 while the preliminary Consumer Price Index for April, year on year, came in at 1.2 percent, which was slightly lower than the previous reading.

The UK's equity market was one of the best performers across global equities in April. The FTSE 100 posted a gain of 6.4 percent in April, marking its first month of positive return in 2018. Brexit remains a primary concern, although during April, UK's parliament attached two amendments to the EU Withdrawal Bill moving further away from a hard divorce. Mixed economic data during the month has reduced market expectations of a Bank of England rate hike in their May meeting. The UK economy remains robust with the Markit Manufacturing PMI above 50 at 53.9. The preliminary reading of Q1 GDP, year on year, came in at 1.2 percent, which was slightly lower than then the previous reading of 1.4 percent.

Trade dialogue Japan's Nikkei 225 reversed its negative performance from the previous two months, closing in April up 4.7 percent. During the month, Japan's Prime Minister visited the US and agreed to open a trade dialogue with the US. The Bank of Japan at their latest meeting left their key interest rate unchanged although it did suggest that it is struggling to achieve its 2.0 percent inflation target despite the strong economic data and overall growth. The Nikkei Manufacturing PMI came in above 50 at 53.8 while the Markit Service PMI also came in above 50 at 52.9.

In terms of Emerging markets, the MSCI Emerging Market Index in April continued its losing streak for the third month straight, closing in the red 0.6 percent. On a year to date basis the index remains positive given the stellar performance in January of 8.3 percent. Throughout the month, a US China trade war

has taken center stage. Towards the end of the month, President Trump sent an economic team to Beijing in the hopes of dialing back the rhetoric and coming to an understanding. On the Korean peninsula, North and South Korean leaders met for the first time in 11 years. The one-day meeting is historic with both ends declaring a mutual effort to "establish a permanent and solid peace on the Peninsula". The Shanghai Composite Index continued to underperform for the third month running closing in the red, down 2.7 percent while the KOSPI 200 Index posted a gain of 2.8 percent. On the economic front in China, the NBS Manufacturing PMI and Non-Manufacturing PMI came in above 50 at 51.4 and 54.8, respectively. Furthermore, the year on year Q1 GDP came in at 6.8 percent, no different than the previous reading.

Brent Oil in April closed up 7.0 percent marking its second month straight of positive performance. On a year to date basis, the commodity has increased in price by 12.4 percent reaching a 40-month high of \$73.48 pbl. Brent prices increased due to geopolitical concerns ranging from renewed sanctions on Iran to air strikes on Syria. Further providing support to the price rise was the strengthening of global demand and reduced crude inventory levels throughout the month. Gold, on the other hand, did not perform nearly as well, dropping in April 0.8 percent.

GCC equities ended the month in the green 3.1 percent as measured by the S&P GCC Index. The GCC equity markets were supported by higher oil prices with Qatar taking the lead, up 6.3 percent, followed by Saudi Arabia up 4.3 percent and Abu Dhabi up 1.8 percent. The worst performing index was Bahrain Bourse's All Share Index down 4.6 percent, followed by Kuwait's down 3.2 percent and Dubai down 1.4 percent. MENA equities, as measured by the S&P Pan Arab Composite Index, also closed the month of April in the Green 2.7 percent with Egypt's EGX 30 posting positive returns of 4.8 percent.

Kenyan herders turn to grazing app to cut drought risks

Afriscout app uses satellite images to identify surface water

ARKAMANA, Kenya: During times of drought, herder Buchu Boru has to walk tens of kilometers in search of pasture for his animals - with no guarantee he will find it. "Somebody tells you by word of mouth that there is pasture but on arriving you don't (find) any," said the 60-year-old, who has had


to walk from his home all the way across the Ethiopian border to find grass some years. But next time the rains fail - an increasingly common problem in northern Kenya - he hopes a new mobile phone app will help him move his livestock to fodder without too much cost or waste of time.

The Afriscout app, which uses satellite images to identify where there is grass and surface water, "is better than what we are used to", he said. As climate change

brings longer droughts and more unpredictable rainfall, herders often need to travel further and to less-well-known areas to find grass and water for their animals. Technology that reduces the uncertainties associated with the journeys can help protect herds and incomes, making families more resilient to the harsher conditions, experts say.

Wrong advice

Boru and his neighbors normally rely on

meters away, where he had heard there was pasture.

But "on arrival at Ambalo, there was no pasture. It was dry. I lost 13 cattle in total, some on the way and others in Ambalo," Boru said. With the app, "we will not be gambling with our livestock," he said. "We will be very sure where the pasture and water is and we will just head there." Afriscout, developed by Project Concern International (PCI), a California-based development organization, launched in Boru's area in February.

As well as providing detailed grazing maps showing water and grass conditions, herders can contribute information about livestock diseases, predators and conflicts. The app so far has about 3,000 users in Kenya, though PCI hopes to increase that to 4,000 once it finishes mapping Samburu County, home to the Samburu herding community. The app is already used in Tanzania and Ethiopia and PCI plans to deploy it in Niger soon, said Brenda Wandera, the organization's acting representative in Kenya.

Twenty kilometers north of Boru's village of Arkamana lies Kukub, where Liban Waqo lives with his 40 cattle, 30 goats and a dozen camels. The 57-year-old complains that drought is becoming more frequent and severe in his area. "We have tried digging boreholes, some even 290 meters deep, but we were not successful. Fifteen boreholes have been dug but we found water in only one," he said. Now he has installed the PCI app on his phone and hopes that it will come in handy when the next dry season starts.

Few phones

The new app faces a few challenges, including limited mobile phone connectivity in some areas, and broad use of durable old-style mobile phones rather than more fragile smart phones. So far, few herders in the region own

smart phones - but that may change if they find the app useful, said Andrew Mude of the International Livestock Research Institute (ILRI).

"We have seen evidence of pastoralists accessing smartphones when they recognize the value it delivers," said Mude who helped pioneer the use of satellite imagery to trigger insurance payouts for herders when forage is scarce. Mude says the app could be improved by including a broader range of information - including data about the market price of livestock. -Reuters

'Game-changer' phone app aims to end child marriage in Bangladesh

LONDON: A new phone app could be a "game-changer" in the fight against child marriage in Bangladesh, where more than half of all girls are married before they are 18, children's charity Plan International said yesterday. The impoverished South Asian nation has one of the world's highest rates of child marriage, according to UNICEF, despite laws that ban girls under 18 and men under 21 from marrying.

The mobile app being rolled out by Plan and the Bangladesh government aims to prevent it by allowing matchmakers, priests and officers who register marriages to verify the bride and groom's ages through a digital database. "If we could get the people involved in the initial stages of marriage on side as well, then there

would be no one to solemnize, no one to register and no one to arrange a marriage for a child," said Soumya Guha, a director at Plan Bangladesh.

"The app could be the game-changer that we need," he said, adding that it stopped 3,750 underage marriages during a six-month trial. Campaigners say girls who marry young often drop out of school and face a greater risk of rape, domestic abuse and forced pregnancies, which may put their lives in danger. The app, which has an offline text messaging version for rural areas, gives the user access to a database that stores a unique identification number linked to the three documents.

When one of the numbers is entered, it shows "proceed" if the person is of legal age and a red "warning!" if not. All marriages in Bangladesh must be legally registered within 30 days of the ceremony, but many are not. A hard copy of a birth certificate, school leaving document or national identity card works as age proof, but often parents who want to marry off their children often forge them. The charity is training 100,000 officiants about the ill effects of child marriage and how to use the app, which it hopes to roll out nationally by August. "I believe this app will help us achieve the commitment by our honorable prime minister to eliminate child marriage before 2041," Muhammad Abdul Halim, a director general at the prime minister's office, said. -Reuters

How to pick a new password, now that Twitter wants one

NEW YORK: Yet another service is asking you to change your password. Twitter said Thursday it discovered a bug that stored passwords in an internal log in plain text, without the usual encryption. Though Twitter says there's no indication that anyone has stolen or misused those passwords, the company s recommending a change as a precaution. Here are some tips on coming up with a new password and safeguarding your account - even if your password is compromised.

Complexity counts

Don't even think of using "password" as your password. Picking any common word as your password should be avoided because it's easily guessed using software that tries out every word in the dictionary. However, you can get a good password by combining two or more words, such as "rocketcalendar." Sprinkle in some numerals and punctuation marks, and make some of those letters in caps, and you've got a strong password.

So "rocketcalendar" becomes "rocket44!calendaR." (But don't use that one; the fact that it's in this article means hackers probably already have it in their databases.) Some services will even require your passwords to have certain characteristics. As you type a new password on Twitter, the service will tell you whether it's "Too Obvious" or "Weak." Go for "Very Strong."

China's ZTE seeks end to ban on buying American technology

HONG KONG: Chinese technology company ZTE says it has applied to the US Commerce Department asking it to suspend a seven-year ban on it doing business with US technology exporters. The company said in a statement late Sunday that it had "formally submitted" request to the Commerce Department's Bureau of Industry and Security for a "stay of the Denial Order." It said it sent the bureau "supplemental information" following the ban. It gave no details in its brief statement.

ZTE Corp., which makes smartphones and telecoms equipment, was hit with the ban last month in a case involving exports of telecom gear to Iran and North Korea. The company has said that the ban threatens its existence by cutting off access to US suppliers of key components like microchips.

The suspension came amid worsening trade tensions between the US and China centered on technology-related intellectual property, though the case dates back to before President Donald Trump took office in January 2017. US officials met last week in Beijing to discuss trade issues with their Chinese counterparts.

During the meetings, Chinese officials said they also raised their objections to ZTE's punishment with the US delegation, who they said agreed to report them to Trump. US authorities imposed the penalty after discovering that Shenzhen-based ZTE, which had paid a \$1.2 billion fine in the case, had failed to discipline employees involved and paid them bonuses instead.-AP

Artificial limbs give hope to Boko Haram amputees

ICRC sets up limb-fitting workshop at Kano hospital

It feels like

a miracle

to walk

as he wobbles on his artificial leg with the support of crutches as a nurse walks alongside, helping him to keep his balance. Maidugu, 35, never thought he would walk on two legs again after he lost his right limb in a Boko Haram suicide bomb attack at a checkpoint in Maiduguri, northeast Nigeria, in 2016. "It feels like a miracle to walk with two legs again, I'm happy," the fuel station attendant said at the National Orthopaedic Hospital in the northern city of Kano.

"These are my first steps on two legs in two years and I

at his new plastic leg outside a prosthetics workshop. Maidugu was one of about 130 people who lost limbs in Boko Haram attacks and have been fitted with free artificial replacements in a project run by the International Committee of the Red Cross. The ICRC set up the limb-fitting workshop at the hospital in August 2016 to provide prosthetics to amputees from the three northeastern states worst hit by the Islamist insurgency.

The jihadist violence, now in its ninth year, has killed at least 20,000 people and left thousands of others with lifechanging injuries. "Half of the 262 patients we have fitted with prosthetics are (Boko Haram) war victims," said the head of the project, Jacques Forget. "The primary focus of the project is to cater for amputees from the conflict, women and children.

Bombs and bullets

The Boko Haram conflict has destroyed the livelihoods of millions of people in a region that was already desperately poor even before the violence began. Most of the population in northeast Nigeria live on less than \$2 a day. That makes prosthetic limbs-which cost on average nearly \$700 (585 euros) - prohibitively expensive. As well as those injured by the bombs and bullets of Boko Haram, other beneficiaries include diabetics, victims of car crashes and industrial accidents. Babagana Habu, for example, hopped around with the help of a stick for 13 years after losing a leg in an accident with a grinding machine, until he heard about the project. "My parents were too poor to get me crutches to walk with," said the 25-year-old recharge card vendor,

"Not many mines are used in the conflict, unlike in many conflict areas I have worked in," said Forget who has worked on artificial limbs for almost 50 years. Amputees are first assessed in the Borno state capital, Maiduguri, where the ICRC runs a medical clinic that caters specifically for victims of Boko Haram attacks. The clinic complements services provided by a handful of state-run hospitals in the feel like a toddler learning to walk," he added, looking down city which has been overstretched by the sharp rise in emergency cases from the

jihadist violence.

The conflict has seen an exodus of doctors and other health service personnel from Maiduguri, leaving a huge gap that other medical charities, are working to fill. The University of Maiduguri Teaching Hospital (UMTH), which treats the bulk of trauma patients, has only one consultant orthopedic surgeon. Once potential benefi-

ciaries of artificial limbs are screened, they are then sent for a fitting in Kano, nearly 600 kilometers away.

Huge demand

Forget works on an average of five amputees a week, which is just a fraction of the number of those seeking his services. "There is a massive number of people who need limbs and we would be flooded if we opened our doors to everyone of them," he said, surveying the stump from Maidugu's atrophied thigh. Maidugu heard about the free prosthetics project from a friend who convinced him to try is "luck" despite initial doubts.

With five staff, the workshop struggles to meet deadlines to allow patients to return home within a week. "It is a huge problem compounded by the conflict," said Forget. Despite setting up another limb workshop at Ahmadu Bello University Teaching Hospital, in the town of Shika, in neighboring Kaduna state, the demand keeps increasing.

The ICRC plans to open a similar workshop in Maiduguri with construction work expected to start this year in its effort to meet the huge prosthetic demand. "We are trying to give them a sense of normality, we give them a little quality of life," said Forget.—AFP

Toddler eaten by leopard in Uganda's national park

KAMPALA: Ugandan authorities were vesterday hunting for a leopard that snatched and ate the three-year-old son of a female ranger working in the popular Queen Elizabeth National Park. The boy had been left in the care

of a nanny at the unfenced staff quarters of a safari lodge in the park, when he was taken by the leopard on Friday night. Wildlife authority spokesman Bashir Hangi said the child had followed the nanny outdoors.

"The maid was not aware the child followed her. She heard the kid scream for help, she intervened but it was too late the leopard had vanished with it in the bush and a search was mounted until we got the skull the next day," he said. "The hunt is on with the intention of capturing the leopard and removing it from the wild because once it has eaten human flesh, the temptations are high to eat another human being, it becomes dangerous," he added.-AFP

MINOGUE DUMPED 'COUNTRY' SONGS

L actor - who is best known for the 'Die Hard' franchise - is set to star in the Rupert Friend movie, which follows the retired manager as he makes a return to the game when a 13-year-old Tyson shows he has huge potential in the ring. Friend describes the feature as a 'story about fighting for what you believe in", as D'Amato carries out a search to find the teenager a suitable opponent. Tyson was the undefeated heavyweight champion until 1990, when he was knocked out by outsider Buster Douglas in Japan. D'Amato - who also managed the careers of Floyd Patterson and Jose Torres; all of whom went on to become members of the International Boxing Hall of Fame - died in November 1985, at the age of 77. 'Homeland' helmer Friend joins Aimee Mullins on producing duties for Circus Florist Films, along with MadRiver Pictures' Marc Butan and Ara Keshishian. According to Screen Daily, production is due to commence later this year. Friend commented: "Ultimately, this is a story about a deep love between two ferocious talents, each brave enough to admit their fears to the other, and so spur one another to greatness. "It is a story about fighting for what you believe in, and a film that will make you question what strength really is." Willis is currently filming 'Motherless Brooklyn', in which he portrays Frank Minna, who is murdered in New York in the 1950s, and he's also working on a sixth 'Die Hard' movie. Willis stars as the wisecracking police detective John McClane in the movies - which are based on author Roderick Thorp's novel 'Nothing Lasts Forever' - and was last seen as the iconic character back in 2013 in 'A Good Day To Die Hard'. Two years ago a "part-prequel, part-sequel" was announced and Willis is back on board, but talk of the film quieted down. However, while appearing on 'The Tonight Show Starring Jimmy Fallon' in February, Willis confirmed the movie is still happening. When asked if it is still going ahead, he said: "I'm about to wing out to California to start to see what the script looks like. "So I think so, yeah." Half of the movie known as 'Die Hard: Year One' - will see McClane as a rookie police officer in the early 1980s, with the rest of the movie being set in the present day. Casting is already underway to find a younger McClane and director Len Wiseman said last year: "The right casting for this role is crucial. Those bare feet have some very big shoes to fill."

Feig wants to make a Ghostbusters sequel

Daul Feig wants to make a sequel to

'Ghostbusters 2'. The filmmaker previously admitted he "regrets" the lack of success surrounding his remake of the hugely popular 1984 Ivan Reitman movie, which most notably swapped the main roles from male to female, and starred the likes of Melissa McCarthy, Kristen Wiig and Kate McKinnon. However, he has since admitted he will go "to my grave so proud of that movie" and would love to do work with the cast again on a second installment. Speaking to Yahoo, Feig said: "We would love [to make another movie], it's really up to the studio. We had so much fun making that movie. "The movie's just really built an audience in the two years since it's been out. "I get contacted every day by people who are such fans of it, and so many women who are inspired by seeing women in science. "I will go to my grave so proud of that movie, and so proud of what

that cast did in that film." Despite creating a buzz when it was announced, the 2016 feature didn't do as well as expected when it hit cinema screens, and Paul said at the time he believed the fact that the movie unintentionally



became a "cause" movie for gender equality, is the reason it didn't sell as well as it had hoped. He explained previously: "I think it kind of hampered us a little bit because the movie became so much of a cause. I think for some of our audience, they were like, 'What the hell? We don't wanna go to a cause. We just wanna watch a movie." Feig admitted the lack of success

It was only supposed to be there to entertain people."


FROM NEW ALBUM

ylie Minogue dumped a load of songs from her album because she thought they sounded "too country." The 49-year-old singer released her 14th studio album 'Golden' last month but she has admitted, although she wanted to put a country spin on it, she felt like some of the tracks which she recored in Nashville, Tennessee - were a little bit too overboard and she wanted to stick to her pop roots. She explained: "We did some songs in Nashville that were a step too far for me. I've learnt a lot about songwriting... having two weeks in Nashville, that changed so much for me." Tennessee is the home state of country legend Dolly Parton - one of Kylie's biggest inspirations - so the pop princess couldn't resist soaking up everything to do with the blonde bombshell during her stay. elly Rowland can't remember what her late mother's voice sounds like. The 37-yearold singer was reduced to tears during this weekend's episode of 'The Voice Australia' when she recalled the sudden death of her mum Doris back in 2014. The brunette beauty had been trying to offer some support to her contestant Hannah Pearce - whose father was killed by a roadside bomb while he was serving in Afghanistan - but struggled to hold it together when she thought back to her own life. And the 'Motivation' hitmaker said she isn't "ready" to talk about the last thing she said to her mother, as she says the conversation is one of her "greatest regrets". Asked what she last said to her mother before her passing, Kelly said: "That's a tough question. It's one of my greatest regrets. It's something I'll carry to my grave ... or eventually talk about, but I'm not ready now."

Bollywood's Khan dodges limelight in jail appeal hearing

ndian movie star Salman Khan managed to avoid the spotlight when he returned to court yesterday over his five-year jail sentence for killing endangered wildlife. Khan, one of the world's highest-paid actors, was convicted last month of shooting dead two rare antelopes known as black bucks on a 1998 hunting trip. He spent two days behind bars before being granted bail. The Bollywood icon was ordered to appear in court yesterday and an early-morning hearing was held in Jodhpur, in the western state of Rajasthan. Khan arrived in a white SUV and slipped into court around 8:00 am (0230 GMT) surrounded by minders, catching Indian media and his army of fans off guard. Court sessions generally start much later in India.

The judge, Chandra Kumar Songara, quickly adjourned proceedings after Khan's defense team requested more time to prepare their appeal. Khan, who is not allowed to leave the country without permission but has been filming a new movie in India, returned directly to Jodhpur airport after the hearing. "We will begin arguments on the appeal against the five-year sentence from July 17," said defense counsel Mahesh Bora. Prosecutors said they would oppose the appeal bid and were ready to present their case.

Four other actors were acquitted in last month's verdict and Khan has repeatedly denied killing the creatures-accusing Rajasthan's forest department of trying to frame him. His lawyers claim the black bucks

died of natural causes such as overeating, insisting there was no evidence they were shot. Throughout the multiple cases, eyewitnesses have stated they saw Khan firing a gun. The 52-year-old enjoys a cult-like status in starobsessed India and is one of Bollywood's biggest draws, despite a host of controversies. Khan was in a vehicle in Mumbai in 2002 when it mounted the curb and killed a homeless man sleeping on the pavement. He was found guilty of culpable homicide and sentenced to five years in prison, but the verdict was overturned by a higher court in 2015. His acquittal is being challenged in the Supreme Court. - AFP

CANNES GOLDEN **COUPLE BARDEM** AND CRUZ RETURN TO OPEN FESTIVAL

t was where Javier Bardem memorably declared his love for Penelope Cruz in 2010 — now the golden couple of Spanish cinema will open this year's Cannes film festival together today. The Oscar-winning actors both star in Iranian master Asghar Farhadi's Spanish psychological thriller "Everybody Knows", which will kick off the festival and is up for the top Palme d'Or prize. The fiercely private couple's glowing return to the spotlight in Cannes comes after Bardem emotionally proclaimed his feelings for Cruz there eight years ago as he accepted the best actor award for "Biutiful".

"I share this joy with my friend, my companion, my love, Penelope. I owe you a lot and I love you so much," he said as Cruz blew kisses to him from her seat and her eyes welled with tears. Cruz has also won at Cannes, sharing the 2006 best actress prize with five other women for their work in acclaimed Spanish filmmaker Pedro Almodovar's drama "Volver".

First Spanish Oscar-winners

Bardem, 49, and Cruz, 44, have two children together and married in 2010 on an island in the Bahamas owned by their friend, US actor Johnny Depp. They also share a notable distinction-they are respectively the first Spanish man and woman to win an acting Oscar. Bardem won his best supporting actor Academy Award in 2008 for his role as a determined murderer in the Coen brothers' "No Country for Old Men". The following year Cruz took home the best actress Oscar for playing a fiery artist in Woody Allen's "Vicky Cristina Barcelona". But the couple live discreetly in a Madrid suburb, where they try to keep the spotlight away from their son Leo, seven, and daughter Luna, four. They have starred in nine films together, including last year's "Loving Pablo", by Spanish director Fernando Leon de Aranoa, in which Bardem plays Colombian drug lord Pablo Escobar and Cruz a journalist who falls in love with the infamous narco. After filming a particularly difficult scene, Bardem joked that Cruz "did not want to see me anymore". "She told me: 'Get rid of the moustache. Shave and go sleep in the living room'," he recalled in an interview in March.

Bollywood star Siddiqui takes 'free speech' hero to Cannes

red carpet at Cannes he may take a moment to ponder just how far he has come and where he is headed. In just over a decade, Siddiqui has gone from a struggling bit-part actor worried about finding food to an acclaimed international star coveted by directors for his versatility across all genres. "When your film gets selected in a good category, you feel confident that you are on the right track and your choice of films is good," Siddiqui told AFP in an interview.

His latest film sees him play the lead role in "Manto", a biopic about the troubled life of Indian-Pakistani writer Saadat Hasan Manto. The movie, directed by Nandita Das, has been selected for the Un Certain Regard category of the film festival which opens today. "I enjoy Cannes because it is such a big and prestigious platform. It's a whole world revolving around films," said Siddiqui. Manto (1912-1955) is considered to be one of the Indian subcontinent's greatest ever short story writers. He was lauded for being bold and progressive and a proponent of free speech, writing truthfully about the brutal violence that followed the partition of British India. To others he was a subversive troublemaker whose stories featuring pimps and prostitutes broke too many taboos. Manto was charged with obscenity a total of six times by authorities in colonial and independent India.

Breakthrough

He died from organ failure caused by excessive alcohol consumption aged just 42. "Manto was an honest man who wrote what he saw. He was transparent and there was no hypocrisy in his life," said Siddiqui, who is 43. "He thought about things in the 1940s which we fail to see or think

hen Indian actor Nawazuddin Siddiqui walks the about even today. He spoke and wrote the truth, and truth never gets old. To play him you have to be truthful too," he added. Siddiqui is one of Hindi cinema's great success stories-a poor man, who from humble beginnings in a village in Uttar Pradesh state, defied the odds to make it big in Bollywood after moving to Mumbai in 2000.

By his own admission the chances were stacked against him: "I'm a five-foot six-inch, dark, ordinary-looking man. People didn't imagine I would make it," he told AFP in 2015. But after years of playing small parts Siddiqui achieved his breakthrough in 2012 with "Talaash", "Gangs of Wasseypur", "Miss Lovely" and "Bajrangi Bhaijaan". He has not looked back. "I spent 10-12 years struggling. My lowest point was to find food and survive. Now I can do the work according to my choices," he said at his office, a collection of posters from his biggest hits hanging on a wall behind him. Siddiqui has held his own with superstars like Shah Rukh Khan and Salman Khan and also successfully crossed over into Hollywood, appearing in the 2016 hit "Lion".

Playing a Hindu hardliner

He is considered to be one of the few actors who can straddle both commercial Bollywood and independent film genres, putting him in high demand. After "Manto", Siddiqui will be seen in the Netflix adaptation of Vikram Chandra's novel "Sacred Games". It releases on July 6 and will be the site's first original Indian series. He is currently shooting for what he describes as his "most difficult" character yet-divisive Mumbai politician Bal Thackeray, who died in 2012. Thackeray founded and led the Hindu farright Shiv Sena party, which has campaigned against Muslims and sought to bar migrant "outsiders" from Mumbai. Siddiqui is both.

"Credit goes to the family and the producer who must have realised I could do justice to this complex and difficult role," he said. Siddiqui will be in Cannes from May 13-15 before returning to India to finish shooting "Thackeray" which releases in January 2019. He has become a fixture on la Croisette since debuting with "Gangs of Wasseypur" (2012), walking the red carpet more than half a dozen times. "The Lunchbox" was screened there in 2013 while "Raman Raghav" followed in 2016. A suit that Siddiqui had made by a Indian tailor for his first visit has been a feature of all of his appearances. This time, however, he is ditching it for a stylish tuxedo fashioned by one of India's top designers-symbolic perhaps of how far he has come. "The suit has its own story. But there should be change. We can't hold onto the past," said Siddiqui. - AFP

Italian cinema 'giant' Ermanno Olmi dies aged 86

Dalme d'Or winning director Ermanno Olmi has died at the age of 86 after a long battle with illness, the Italian Culture Ministry announced yesterday. The Italian director, most famous for his film "The Tree of Wooden Clogs" which won at the Cannes Film Festival in 1978, passed away in Asiago, near Venice. He had long suffered from Guillain-Barre syndrome, a muscle-weakening condition that can immobilize people for extended periods of time. "The death of Ermanno Olmi deprives us of a giant, one of the great maestros of Italian cinema," Culture Minister Dario Franceschini said. "He was a deep intellectual who explored the mysteries of man and recounted, with the poetry that characterizes his work, the relationship between man and nature."

Born in Bergamo in northern Italy in 1931, Olmi was a self-taught neo-realist filmmaker who produced a host of short films, documentaries and features. His most acclaimed, "The Tree of Wooden Clogs", was a depiction of the life of four poor peasant families in Lombardy at the end of the 19th century and is considered an important work of Italian cinema. Al Pacino named it when asked by the American Film Institute about his favorite films of all time in 2010. —AFP

'Passion for everything'

Bardem was born in 1969 on Spain's Canary Islands off the coast of Africa. His mother, actress Pilar Bardem, raised him after she separated from his father. Bardem dedicated his Oscar to his mother and her line of the family, which includes many actors. Cruz was born in 1974 to a modest family in a working class suburb of Madrid. Her father owned a store and her mother ran a beauty salon, where Cruz said she learnt to act by observing how clients behaved.

Both stars often say that they owe everything to the late Spanish director Bigas Luna, who brought them together for the first time in his 1991 movie "Jamon, Jamon". Cruz was just 17 at the time, and Bardem 22. In the film, their characters have a famous sexual encounter on top of a pinball machine, one of the most torrid scenes in Spanish cinema. The two then crossed paths in several other movies, but only began dating after shooting "Vicky Cristina Barcelona" in 2007 in Barcelona.

While Cruz usually avoids mentioning her husband in interviews, Bardem has spoke of his wife's passion to the media. "She feels passion for everything. It's what I find attractive in her. You have to have beauty and know how to be sexy. Penelope has both," Bardem told GQ magazine last year. Both declare themselves leftwing and were criticized in Hollywood in 2014 for their fierce condemnations of Israeli bombings in Gaza. This year they took part in a campaign by a Spanish NGO which rescues migrants at sea. — AFP

Lego-obsessed crowd packs convention every June near Chicago

I f you think five straight days of Lego are for the kiddie set, think again. Brickworld Chicago is a convention aimed at adults. Teens are welcome. So are tweens. But better nab a grown-up, boys and girls, if you want to hang with this Legoobsessed crowd. Children under 18 must be

'Lego of My Chick'

A Lego bellman even greets guests staying at the Renaissance Schaumburg Convention Center Hotel, an hour's train ride from downtown Chicago, while a restaurant there offers "Lego of My Chick" chicken-and-waffle sandwiches. Local university student Casey McCoy will be back for his eighth

No worries there. We were back in our hotel following the mostly G-rated evening receptions, speeches and charity auctions. And except for a mild curse word or two, conversations were pretty tame. The 2017 convention attracted approxiTry answering "How long did it take you to build this?" and "How many pieces are in this?" again and again and again. Even worse: "Did you glue the pieces together?" Kragle is an evil word among this crowd. (That's a contraction for Krazy Glue for those of you who didn't see 2014?s "The

accompanied by adults. And no skateboarding, please, on the exhibition floor. No need to ask why, what with hundreds of painstakingly crafted Lego creations filling the hall.

Every June, Lego enthusiasts from around the world descend on this northwestern Chicago suburb to build Legos, display Legos, play Legos, talk Legos, swap Legos and win Legos. They watch Lego mini-figure films produced by fellow enthusiasts, and play Lego bingo using cards with minifigure characters instead of numbers and letters. They see who can build the most mini-figures in two minutes flat. This year's convention is slated for June 13-17. The theme is "Seasons."

In the Dirty Buildster competition, participants exchange random Lego pieces, grab-bag style, and try to outdo each other with their concoctions. In hopes of setting a GBC (Great Ball Contraption) world record, they line up GBCs one after the other - some relatively simple, others crazy complicated - to funnel the mini Lego soccer balls from device to device. Last summer, the continuous circuit covered 26 long tables. Lego machines battle, Lego flowers bloom, Lego trains chug, Lego spacecraft hover, Lego bridges loom, Lego superheroes pose, Lego tables and stools actually function, along with Lego TV consoles and Lego refrigerator cases. Brickworld Chicago, this time to help to run its film festival. Last year, he showcased a self-portrait made of more than 3,000 Lego bricks that took him three weeks to build. For the upcoming Brickworld, he created a 3,000-plus-brick portrait of character Eleven from the Netflix series "Stranger Things." It took him 13 hours. "The very best part of Brickworld is meeting new people, getting to know their life stories, what makes them tick, why they love building," McCoy, 22, said via email. Putting a face to an online avatar - "meeting someone from the online world" - is especially satisfying, he wrote.

If you go, you'll need to know some Lego acronyms. MOC stands for My Own Creation, as opposed to a standard-issued Lego kit. AFOL is shorthand for Adult Fans of Lego, TFOL for Teen Fans of Lego, NLSO for Non-Lego Significant Other. I fell into that last category when my 11year-old son and I attended last summer's "Lights, Camera, Bricks" convention at the Schaumburg Convention Center, not long after the release of "The Lego Batman Movie." The staff assured me that my Lego-loving tween would fit in, but warned that late-night socials were strictly for those of legal age and that it was my responsibility, as mom, to remove him from mature conversations or situations.



Not o shoes, no shirt, no problem: A Paris gallery gave nearly 200 people a rare chance for a clothes-free visit this weekend, the latest opportunity for the city's flourishing nudist scene. The Palais de Tokyo, a contemporary art museum in the shadow of the Eiffel Tower, offered the guided tour before opening to the general public on Saturday. "What a day to remember. A new chapter in naturism is opening," the Paris Naturists' Association said on

Twitter after the visit, which the museum called the first of its kind in France. The participants, who snapped up the tickets in just two days after the event was announced last March, were able to take it all off for the show "Discordia, Daughter of the Night".

They were then treated to a private cocktail party on the museum's roof. "An incredible moment, what a success! Mindsets are changing and naturism is becoming commonplace," the nudists' association said. The French capital has become increasingly attentive to fans of baring their all, with the city last year setting aside a designated patch for nudists in the Bois de Vincennes park to the east of the city. They can also enjoy a meal at their own restaurant, named O'Naturel. —AFP
