

252 candidates file nominations to contest polls

KUWAIT: At the close of candidate registration on Sunday, 252 candidates including 15 women filed nomination papers to run in the June 6 parliamentary polls, called after the 2020 National Assembly was dissolved and after the constitutional court annulled the Sept 2022 elections. Forty-seven of the 50 members of the scrapped 2022 Assembly are bidding for re-election, hoping that Kuwaiti voters have not forgotten them in the past eight months.

In addition, 56 former MPs are also in the fray to win a seat in the 50-member house, 30 of whom

were also members of the scrapped 2022 Assembly.

The total number of candidates is below the number in the Sept 2022 elections, when as many as 376 candidates registered for the polls. However, only 305

Erdogan takes early Shaky Gaza lead in Turkish polls truce holds

ANKARA: President Recep Tayyip Erdogan took an early lead Sunday in Turkey's landmark election, state media reported, although the final outcome was likely to change substantially. Erdogan was winning 53.2 percent of the vote with 34.4 percent of the ballots counted, while opposition leader Kemal Kilicdaroglu had 40.9 percent of the vote. Most of the early ballots appeared to have been counted in heavily pro-Erdogan districts of Turkey's north and east.

A spokesman for Kilicdaroglu's Republican People's Party (CHP) said the opposition's internal count showed a "positive" result. "We are seeing a positive picture, according to our data," CHP party spokesman Faik Oztrak said. "We will start to give the numbers when the number of opened ballot boxes reaches a meaningful level."

Istanbul's opposition mayor Ekrem Imamoglu, who could be named vice president if Kilicdaroglu wins, urged the nation not to believe the figures released by Turkey's official Anadolu state news agency. — AFP



GAZA: Calm returned to Gaza Sunday as a fragile ceasefire ending five days of fighting held, leaving Palestinians to count the cost of cross-border fire which has killed dozens. Fishermen took to their boats in the coastal Palestinian enclave, as Gazans emerged from sheltering in their homes during the fierce exchange of fire. The fighting broke out Tuesday with Zionist strikes on the Islamic Jihad militant group. It ceased late Saturday following days of

truce talks led by Egypt.

As the skies fell silent, residents were left to mourn the 33 people killed in the Gaza Strip. After the ceasefire took effect, ambulances and fire trucks drove in convoy in Gaza while Palestinians gathered in the streets to celebrate. More than 50 homes were destroyed and around 950 people displaced in Gaza, said the United Nations citing local officials.

"We're on the street, there's no home for my children or their children," said Mohammed Al-Louh, whose house was destroyed by Zionist strikes. "After the ceasefire, we have an ongoing tragedy because of the great scale of the

Ex-PM Khan calls for protests nationwide

LAHORE: Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan called for nationwide "freedom" protests on Sunday, after his brief arrest and detention this week triggered deadly unrest. The one-time cricket superstar — who has been tied up in dozens of legal cases since being ousted from power in April last year was freed on bail on Friday after his detention was declared unlawful by the Supreme Court.

Enraged by the arrest, supporters set fire to government buildings, blocked roads and damaged property belonging to the military, which they blame for Khan's downfall. "Freedom does not come easily. You have to snatch it. You have to sacrifice for it," he said in an address broadcast on YouTube Saturday night. He called for supporters to hold protests "at the end of your streets and villages" across the country on Sunday evening for one hour starting at 5:30 pm (1230 GMT).

After five days of tumult across Pakistan, Sunday morning was quiet, but Khan has also pledged to return to campaigning on Wednesday for immediate elections. For months, the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf

(PTI) party leader has waged a campaign of defiance against the military. His arrest on Tuesday came just hours after he was rebuked for claiming senior officials were involved in an assassination attempt against him last year. Pakistan's powerful military has directly ruled the country off and on for nearly half of its 75-year history, and continues to wield power over the political system. "The army chief's actions have made our military bad. It is because of him, not because of me," Khan said from his home in Lahore, although it was unclear whether he meant the serving chief, or his predecessor, whom Khan has held responsible for his ouster.

Agriculture Authority requests land for 'stray dogs shelter'

KUWAIT: The Public Authority for Agricultural Affairs and Fish Resources submitted a request to the Municipal Council regarding the allocation of a plot of land with an area of 10,000 square meters in an area far from residential and commercial districts to establish a shelter for stray dogs. The Authority stated its request in a letter addressed by the Acting Director General of the Authority Mishaal Al-Qurayfah to the President of the Municipal Council Abdullah Al-Mehri. "The request comes in view of the exacerbation of the problem of stray dogs in the State of Kuwait as well as its negative social and health effects in addition to the large number of complaints of citizens and national institutions about this phenomenon," the letter said. Qurayfah indicated that the dogs will be taken to the shelter after they are collected and sterilized in accordance with a program implemented by a company specialized in "treating the problem of stray dogs".

Tenders issued for highway maintenance

KUWAIT: Kuwait Today published in its issue on Sunday, the details of the launch of 10 tenders for road repair on Monday, May 15. The tenders will be closed next June 15. According to the details of the tenders, each governorate will have an independent tender in addition to three tenders for the maintenance of highways and one for the Jaber Causeway, provided that the bidding session will be on the same day of closing, in the Great Meeting Hall in the Ministry of Public Works building. The bidding is preceded by a preliminary meeting with interested companies, to be held on June 1.

Family medicine conference first of its kind in Kuwait

KUWAIT: Treasurer of Kuwait Family Medicine Board and Chairwoman of the scientific committee of the Kuwait international Family Medicine Conference Dr Taibah Al-Hassan said the conference will start Thursday, May 18 under the patronage of Health Minister Dr Ahmad Al-Awadi and will be chaired by Chairman of Family Medicine Board Dr Mohammad Al-Azmi. She said the conference will be for three days, and it is the first of its kind in Kuwait.

Hassan said the conference aims at presenting the most recent medical information based on evidence and proofs, developments of family medicine and discussion of several medical strategies.

She added that the conference will include lectures, workshops and contests about scientific research as 60 doctors will participate in various specialties from Kuwait, GCC and the US. She said there will also be a meeting for the Gulf Family Medicine Society on the sidelines of the conference to discuss several strategies and have recommendations to improve family medicine status.

Charities continue humanitarian aid in Turkey, Syria, Sudan

KUWAIT: The International Islamic Charitable Organization launched on Sunday a psychological and social support center aimed at alleviating the negative effects that resulted from the repercussions of the earthquake that hit southern Turkey and northern Syria last February.

The earthquake, considered one of the biggest disasters to impact the region in recent times, left tens of thousands of people dead and many more injured. Thousands of buildings have collapsed, leaving countless people exposed to unforgiving winter conditions. Schools and hospitals have been destroyed.

Acting Director General of the Authority, Abdulrahman Al-Mutawa, said the goal of the center is to help guide, rehabilitate and treat those affected by the earthquake.

"We have 36 teams and volunteer initiatives, including many Kuwaitis. We have 818 activists who set the standards with regard to giving and creativity, contributing with sincere and diligent efforts to

alleviate the suffering of afflicted communities," he said. Head of Psychological Support at the "Tarahum" Volunteer Team in the organization, Dr Othman Al-Asfour, said: "Beneficiaries of the project in southern Turkey are 10,000 people and 50,000 people in Syria."

The project provides training and psychological treatment for survivors of the earthquake and includes psychological support for children, specialized treatment, a mobile center to provide psychological intervention as well as a field study to measure the impact of the earthquake on those affected. In other news, Kuwait has sent its seventh relief aid plane, filled with 10 tons of relief aid to Sudan, the Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS) announced on Sunday.

KRCS' head of public relations and media Khaled Al-Zaid told KUNA that the campaign would hopefully lessen the suffering of the Sudanese people during their ordeal. The relief aid campaign would maintain the air bridge between Kuwait and Sudan to ensure the arrival of much needed materials, he affirmed.

The Kuwaiti government, under the directives of the leadership, kick-started a relief aid campaign to help brethren in Sudan as part of Kuwait's commitment towards this urgent humanitarian issue. — Agencies

Preparations in full swing as election approaches

KUWAIT: The Interior Undersecretary Lieutenant General Anwar Al-Barjas, on Sunday affirmed the security personnel's readiness to organize and secure the National Assembly elections due on June 6. The Ministry of Interior's Directorate General for Public Relations and Information said in a press release that Lt Gen Al-Barjas affirmed, during a visit to the headquarters of the election affairs department, necessity of tackling flaws that happened in the previous parliamentary polls.

Security apparatuses are ready to deal with any emergency to assure voters and candidates to portray Kuwait's true democracy, he said. Lt Gen Al-Barjas, during his visit to the election affairs department, examined all preparations that had been taken for the polling day. He was accompanied during the tour by Major General Abdullah Al-Rejaib, the assistant undersecretary for public security and the assistant undersecretary for traffic and operations.

In related news, the education ministry is reportedly working quickly to equip 123 schools to be used as polling stations during the upcoming elections, sources said. The ministry is conducting repairs at the designated schools and preparing them with the

necessary equipment, such as white boards and furniture, to ensure the elections run smoothly.

Sources said the ministry has allocated KD 123,000 for the process, with KD 1,000 per school.

The number of polling stations set by the Ministry of Interior are five main stations per district, in addition to 118 sub-committees distributed among the schools where the elections will be held. — Agencies

Digitization a priority for serving clients: **Minors Affairs**

KUWAIT: The Public Authority for Minors Affairs will continue intensifying its efforts to digitize its services as the number of those under its care has reached about 50,000 by the end of 2022.

The Minister of Justice, Awqaf and Islamic Affairs and Chairman of the board of Directors of the Public Authority for Minors Affairs, Dr Amer

Al-Rattam said the authority has already launched 46 electronic services through its website and 36 services through the government's (Sahel) application. The launch, he said, has helped the authority enhance its abilities to reach people who need their services.

Acting Director General of the authority Hamad Al-Barjas said the authority has achieved good financial results in recent years despite the challenges it faced as a result of health, political and economic developments that negatively reflected on the markets. Through the Sahel app and the authority's website, it was able to continue providing its services remotely, he said. — KUNA

Property, residency curbs complicate matters for expatriates in Kuwait

Expats find it challenging to plan for their future due to lack of stability

KUWAIT: Due to its oil industry and flourishing economy, Kuwait has been a popular destination for expatriates seeking better financial opportunities. However, life as an expat in Kuwait can come with its challenges and struggles. From expats who were born in Kuwait and have grown old here to expats who recently came to Kuwait, all of them face obstacles that can be resolved to ease their lives in Kuwait. From being a major part of Kuwait's community and playing an important role in Kuwait's workforce and financial stability, Kuwait Times focuses on a few expectations that expats would love to see in Kuwait.

Facilitate owning property

Fatma, an expat in Kuwait, said: "The difficulty of owning property is a major problem, as we are not able to invest our hard-earned money into a secure and tangible asset. It makes it difficult to plan for a long-term future in the country, so expats are left with no choice but to entrust their financial stability to the often-unpredictable rental market."

Not being allowed to buy prop-



erty is a significant issue that affects expats' quality of living. It limits their investment opportunities, creates instability in their lives and contributes to the feeling that they are not fully integrated into the society. Therefore, addressing this issue would not only benefit the expat community, but also contribute positively to Kuwait's overall economic growth and development.

Allow permanent residency Fatma also highlighted the issue of forcing some expats over 60 to leave. "Kuwait is seen as a home country by many expats. My uncle and wife were in Kuwait before the Iraqi invasion. They lived their life, worked and raised their children and grandchildren in Kuwait. However, they had to leave Kuwait because they reached 60 years of age. Due to such laws, besides visa restrictions, you can barely see expat families," she added.

One of the most significant issues that expats face in Kuwait is the lack of permanent residency, because the issue of forcing expats over the age of 60 to leave regardless of how long they have stayed and served the state feeds a sense of insecurity, which can impact their mental health and cause stress due to their inability to plan for their future in Kuwait.

Open visit visas for families

Visa restrictions' impact on expats in Kuwait has been a subject of significant concern for expats, as these restrictions lead to several challenges and limitations on expats living in Kuwait, which affects their daily lives, productivity and social connections. Ala'a, an expat, confirmed visa curbs have a significant impact on expats' social lives and connections.

"Expats are restricted from inviting family members and friends to visit them in Kuwait, which means they are away from their emotional and social support system, that is, their loved ones back home. This negatively affects their performance at work and creates a sense of disconnect between themselves and the state because they are only meant to earn money and leave, rather than investing their knowledge by growing their businesses and future in Kuwait," he opined.

Kuwait Municipality launches two-month cleaning campaign

KUWAIT: Kuwait Municipality announced Sunday the launch of a cleaning campaign to educate people about the importance of maintaining public places hygienic. The campaign will continue until July 13.

Deputy Director General for Services Sector Affairs at Kuwait Municipality Mishaal Al-Azmi said: "The campaign aims to instill healthy habits in terms of public hygiene and environmental health and consolidate them for young people for future generations."

Azmi pointed out that the campaign aims to educate the public by spreading awareness about public hygiene as well as environmental protection. It mainly focuses on instilling the concept of correct disposal of waste and adhering to the specified garbage removal dates.

"It also aims to educate the public about the positive and negative effects with regard to public hygiene and their relationship to maintaining public health, as well as conducting a comprehensive survey, accurate monitoring and evaluation of places and sites that require intensifying hygiene services," he said. Azmi said that the campaign also aims to increase the rate of cleanliness and remove accumulated waste.

"The campaign includes raising awareness through a far-reaching campaign in coordination with concerned authorities and the participation of all administrative, technical and legal human cadres in the Kuwait Municipality," he added. "The mechanism also includes the participation of the public and private sectors represented by state ministries, government agencies and the private sector to contribute effectively to cleaning work and maintaining the health of the environment," Azmi clarified.

He explained that it also includes the provision of mechanisms, equipment, tools and labor to carry out the required public cleaning work in all governorates as well as the necessary action towards the observations and complaints received, if any, to achieve the desired objectives of that campaign.

"We call on everyone to adhere to the laws regulating public hygiene. Violators will be given a grace period for reconciliation and removal of the violation, and in the event of non-response, legal procedures will be applied against the violator." Azmi stressed that pertinent regulations will be applied to those who do not remove their waste wherever that might be and that inspectors will be fairly distributed to the six governorates to ensure the campaign runs smoothly. — KUNA.

Social media trend identifying single people stirs debate

KUWAIT: A new trend has gone viral recently, calling singles to put a pear emoji in their social media bio to indicate they have a state of emotional emptiness. The trend has spread across various social networking sites, as hundreds of users have adopted it. Local buzz on Twitter and Instagram was about how such a trend will help singles in their love life, saying this trend, which is also spreading in the Middle East, will help others understand a person's availability and connect with singles.

Some social media users in Kuwait called the pear emoji phenomenon "ridiculous", while others

decried the far reach of social media on people's lives. Many others may have found the pear is the way to pair! This is not the first time such trends have spread to express people's emotional state. Ahmad Khattab said earlier there was the "numbers" trend, which was a way to express if the person had a crush on someone indirectly through a certain mathematical process.

"The trend was based on the numbers from 901 to 926, which is the number of letters of the English alphabet, where the number 9 expresses I love', and the numbers from 1 to 26 is the first letter of the name of the person who is the focus of admiration, while number 900 means the person is single," he said. "I think singles were upset by the numbers trend because they had no one, so they made the pear trend instead," Khattab said sarcastically.

Meanwhile, Mona Al-Sawaf said that the trend may cause problems in conservative communities, where hopping on such trends means you're searching for a boyfriend, adding girls will not be allowed to participate in the numbers or the pear trends due to religious and traditional reasons, considering it as a bad dating solution.

The trend started when a company named Pear made special rings that make it simple to identify single people, allowing new connections to find partners in real life. While some people might be wearing rings, others resorted to putting a pear emoji in their bios and taking part in a social experiment in the US, UK, Germany, Canada and Australia. The company aims to eliminate the need for dating apps by encouraging singles all over the world to wear small green rings.

Fire in Abdullah Al-Salem co-op

KUWAIT: A fire broke out at the Abdullah Al-Salem Cooperative Society on Sunday morning. The Public Relations and Media department at the Kuwait Fire Force said Central Operations dispatched firefighting teams from Al-Shaheed and Kuwait City stations upon receiving a report that there was a fire at the cooperative. After investigation, they found that garbage was on fire on the roof of the cooperative's service building. The fire was extinguished without any injuries.

'Suspicious' driver with cleaver arrested

KUWAIT: Patrolmen supporting the Jahra Security Directorate were able to arrest a Kuwaiti young man in his 30s who was found to be using drugs. The man was caught while driving a "suspicious" four-wheel drive car in the Saad Al-Abdullah area. Officers ordered him to pull over and searched his vehicle only to discover that he was in possession of narcotic substances, weapons, a cleaver and a sum of money. He was then referred to the General Administration for Drug Control along with the illegal substances.

219 residency violators caught

KUWAIT: The General Directorate of Residency Affairs Investigations arrested 219 people who were found in violation of Kuwait's residency and work laws. The busts were made in Abdali, Wafra, Kabd and Salmiya through surprise inspection campaigns. This came through the establishment of checkpoints distributed in those areas by the General Directorate of Residency Affairs Investigation with the participation of the Public Authority of Manpower and the Ministry of Commerce. Those who were arrested were referred to the authorities in order to take all necessary legal measures against them.

Official recounts country's contributions as UN member

KUWAIT: Since joining the UN on May 14, 1963 as the 111th member, the State of Kuwait had been keen on collaborating with the organization to boost international cooperation and sustainable development worldwide. Speaking to KUNA on the anniversary of joining the UN, Assistant Foreign Minister for International Affairs Minister Plenipotentiary Abdulaziz Al-Jarallah commended the exemplary relations between Kuwait and the UN throughout the years.

The State of Kuwait had abided by the UN charter since joining the organization, affirmed Jarallah, who lauded the strong and strategic cooperation with the international organization. He thanked the UN for its unequivocal supportive stance towards Kuwait during the Iraqi invasion of 1990 and the subsequent efforts played by the UN and other international players in the liberation of 1991. The liberation of Kuwait had reflected the strength of international coordination in rallying support to a just cause, affirmed Jarallah.

In regards to the Kuwait's non-permanent membership in the UN Security Council (UNSC) 2018-19, Jarallah said that Kuwait focused its efforts during its tenure to highlight Arab and Islamic causes as well as bolstering security and peace in several regions specifically the Middle East where the Palestinian cause is a focal issue that needed to be resolved.

The Kuwaiti efforts at the UNSC had resulted in various resolutions including 2019's resolution 2474, which gained approval from the majority at the UNSC. The resolution pertained to missing persons

during armed conflict. In joint efforts with Sweden, Germany, and Belgium in 2018, resolutions 2401 and 2449 came to fruition concerning the humanitarian situation in war-torn Syria and efforts to bring a peaceful resolution to the situation there. In April and May of 2018, Kuwait alongside several members of the Security Council visited Bangladesh to view the situation of the Rohingya refugees who fled the Myanmar due to being prosecuted.

In June of 2019, State of Kuwait representatives then President of the UNSC — visited Kuwait and Iraq in coordination with a US delegation. The visit resulted in a press statement commending Kuwait for its efforts to bolster the stability and security in Iraq. The visit to Kuwait in particular was aimed at viewing Iraq's commitment to the cause of missing Kuwaiti citizens on Iraqi soil, Kuwaiti properties, and the national archives.

Asked about the highlights of the six decades membership of Kuwait in the UN, Jarallah said that his country made it its mission to support efforts for international stability and security, adding that Kuwaitis were also keen on assisting humanitarian causes far and wide. He noted that Kuwait's efforts within the humanitarian domain had earned the country the title of international humanitarian center in 2014.

The same honor went to His Highness the late Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah who was named as a global humanitarian leader. Kuwait's relentless efforts made it a perfect candidate for hosting offices of UN agencies and affiliated

Category 5 Cyclone Mocha hits Myanmar, Bangladesh

Volunteers emerged to remove fallen trees and other obstacles from the roads

KYAUKTAW: Cyclone Mocha crashed through Myanmar and southeastern Bangladesh on Sunday, sparing sprawling refugee camps but bringing a storm surge to swathes of western Myanmar where communications were largely cut off.

Mocha made landfall between Cox's Bazar in Bangladesh and Myanmar's Sittwe packing winds of up to 195 kilometres (120 miles) per hour, in the biggest storm to hit the Bay of Bengal in over a decade. By late Sunday the storm had largely passed, AFP correspondents said, and India's weather office said it would weaken as it hit the rugged hills of Myanmar's interior.

Some 400-500 makeshift shelters were damaged in camps housing almost one million Rohingya refugees in Bangladesh's Cox's Bazar but there were no immediate reports of casualties, refugee commissioner Mizanur Rahman told AFP.

In Teknaf in Bangladesh volunteers emerged to remove fallen trees and other obstacles from the roads, an AFP correspondent said. Disaster official Kamrul Hasan said the cyclone had caused "no major damage" in Bangladesh, adding authorities had evacuated 750,000 people ahead of the storm.

Communications with the port town of Sittwe in Myanmar were largely cut off following the storm, AFP correspondents said. Streets in the town of around 150,000 people were turned into rivers as the storm surged ashore, tearing roofs from buildings and downing power lines.

The wind ripped apart homes made of tarpaulin and bamboo at one camp for displaced Rohingya at Kyaukphyu in Myanmar's Rakhine state. Its residents were anx-

iously watching the rising sea tide, camp leader Khin Shwe told AFP.

"We are now going to check whether sea water is increasing to our place... if the seawater rises, our camp can be flooded," he said. Thousands left Sittwe on Saturday, packing into trucks, cars and tuk-tuks and heading for higher ground inland as meteorologists warned of a storm surge of up to 3.5 metres (11 feet).

"We are not okay because we didn't bring food and other things to cook," said Maung Win, 57, who spent the night in a shelter in Kyauktaw town further inland. "We can only wait to get food from people's donations."

'Major emergency'

The Myanmar Red Cross Society said it was "preparing for a major emergency response". In Bangladesh, authorities have banned Rohingya refugees from constructing concrete homes, fearing it may encourage them to settle permanently rather than return to Myanmar, which they fled five years ago following a brutal military crackdown.

The camps are generally slightly inland but most of them are built on hillsides, exposing them to the threat of landslides. Forecasters expect the cyclone to bring a deluge of rain, which can trigger landslips.

Hundreds of people also fled Bangladesh's Saint Martin's island, a local resort area right in the storm's path, with thousands more moving to cyclone shelters on the coral outcrop. The storm had uprooted hundreds of trees on the island councillor Noor Ahmed told AFP.

death. Two persons were injured as they were hit by fallen trees." Cyclone Mocha is the most powerful storm to hit Bangladesh since Cyclone Sidr, Azizur Rahman, the head of Bangladesh's Meteorological Department, told AFP.

Sidr hit Bangladesh's southern coast in November 2007, killing more than 3,000 people and causing billions of dollars in damage. In recent years, better forecasting and more effective evacuation planning have dramatically reduced the death toll from such storms.

Operations were suspended at Bangladesh's largest seaport, Chittagong, with boat transport and fishing also halted. Cyclones -- the equivalent of hurricanes in the North Atlantic or typhoons in the Northwest Pacific -- are a regular and deadly menace on the coast of the northern Indian Ocean where tens of millions of people live.

Cyclone Nargis devastated Myanmar's Irrawaddy Delta in 2008, killing at least 138,000 people. Scientists have warned that storms are becoming more powerful as the world gets warmer because of climate change.—AFP

ny's "powerful support" in the form of the armaments package, saying "everything in this security package will significantly strengthen our defence".

"Now is the time for us to determine the end of this war this year. This year, we can make the aggressor's defeat irreversible," he said. Ukrainian forces have been training troops and stockpiling Western-supplied munitions and hardware that analysts say will be key to reclaiming territory captured by Russia.

Once accused of reticence in supplying military gear to Ukraine, Germany has since become the second-biggest contributor of tanks, rockets and anti-missile systems to the country, after the United States.

Scholz on Sunday reiterated Berlin's firm backing, telling Zelensky directly: "We will support you for as long as it is necessary." Zelensky said he would urge Scholz to support Ukraine's bid for fighter jet deliveries, though he did not specify if he was seeking aircraft directly from Germany.

Together with Scholz, Zelensky will head later Sunday to the western German city of Aachen, which this year is awarding him and the Ukrainian people the Charlemagne prize—an honour awarded for efforts to foster European unity.—AFP

Tough new asylum rules spur many migrants to seek legal path to US

Asylum-seekers are supposed to set up an interview appointment through a smartphone application

MATAMOROS: With tough new asylum rules in place, many migrants on the US-Mexico border were seeking legal routes to enter the United States on Saturday, despite warnings of a chaotic surge in crossings

Gustavo Rodriguez, who fled Venezuela after deserting the military, was among those who saw official channels as offering the best chance of being allowed to stay on US soil. "I want to enter legally," he told AFP in Matamoros, one of several Mexican cities along the border where thousands of migrants fleeing poverty, crime or persecution are gathered.

US President Joe Biden's right-wing opponents predicted a rush across the border after pandemic-era restrictions allowing for immediate expulsion ended at midnight Thursday. So far the surge failed to materialize, though thousands of migrants had tried to enter the United States in the days leading up to the rule changes.

That was because anyone crossing the border illegally now faces a five-year ban on applying for legal entry as well as possible criminal charges. Asylum-seekers are supposed to set up an interview appointment through a smartphone application called CBP One or processing centers the US plans in Colombia, Guatemala and other countries.

But migrants say using the app is a lottery, despite Washington's promise to increase the number of appointments available each day to 1,000. Jose Manuel Tovar was one of the lucky ones -- after four months of trying he finally got an appointment. "I cried. My family, all my colleagues were crying with joy," the Venezuelan told AFP.

Political controversy

The policy shift has been contentious, with Biden's supporters on the left saying the new rules are too

strict while opponents on the right have claimed, without evidence, that he is "opening the borders." Mexican President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador called for patience Saturday when reporters asked about the migration crisis during a visit to a border checkpoint in Matamoros.

Mexico said Friday that the number of US-bound migrants crossing its territory was ebbing and the situation at the frontier was calm. "The flux is dropping today. We have not had confrontations or situations of violence on the border," Foreign Minister Marcelo Ebrard told reporters. Around 26,500 migrants were esti ated to be waiting in the main Mexican cities along the frontier, he said. The national immigration agency ordered its offices to stop issuing documents authorizing migrants to transit through Mexico, authorities announced.

Guatemala said that it was bracing for a major humanitarian situation there because it would have to offer shelter to migrants in transit applying for US asylum. Erika Guevara Rosas, Americas director at rights group Amnesty International, said the US government was "outsourcing its border enforcement to Mexico and now Colombia and Guatemala, but it's not willing to take responsibility for the chaos its policies have created."

The legal channels available to migrants also include family reunification programs and humanitarian permits for Venezuelans, Haitians, Nicaraguans and Cubans. In any of these cases, however, migrants must process their claims before arriving at ports of entry.

There are a few exceptions, such as if they were denied asylum in a transit country, have been unable to use the CBP One app or in the case of unaccompanied children. A particular fear of human rights campaigners is that the situation will continue to be exploited by people smugglers who have turned ille-

gal migration into a multimillion-dollar business.

"Some of the most cruel solutions produce disorder and empower people smugglers," said David Miliband, president of the International Rescue Committee (IRC). "The IRC is convinced that there is a practical, safe and orderly way through the current situation, grounded in international experience," he added.

Despite the tough deterrents, Randy Vargas was doubtful that his fellow Venezuelans would stop arriving at the US-Mexico frontier. "We're talking about thousands of Venezuelans just on the border and thousands more coming," he told AFP in Ciudad Juarez, south of El Paso, Texas. "What are they going to do with them?... Migrants will never be stopped," he said — AFP

Sudan becomes battleground for foreign fighters

KHARTOUM: Sudan has long sent mercenaries abroad, but now the country itself has become a battleground for foreign fighters and shadowy military backers lured by money and gold, experts say. Armed "fortune seekers" are flooding into the fight from across Africa's Sahel region including Mali, Chad and Niger, UN special representative Volker Perthes has said, warning that "their number is not insignificant". Sudan's army chief Abdel Fattah al-Burhan has accused the rival Rapid Support Forces (RSF) of recruiting fighters from troubled nearby countries, including "mercenaries from Chad, the Central African Republic and Niger".

Sudan's army has claimed to have killed "a foreign sniper" in the ranks of the RSF, and witnesses in Khartoum say they have heard some RSF paramilitaries speak French, the language of neighbouring Chad.

For the past month, Sudan has been rocked by deadly battles between de facto leader Burhan and his former deputy, RSF commander Mohamed Hamdan Daglo, also known as Hemeti. The RSF under Daglo, a former camel trader, emerged out of the notorious Janjaweed militias which from 2003 pillaged villages in the Darfur region where they were accused of widespread atrocities and war crimes.

In recent years the RSF has sent guns for hire into the Yemen war, on the side of Saudi Arabia and

the United Arab Emirates against Iran-backed Huthi rebels, and to Libya, in support of different camps including eastern-based general Khalifa Haftar.

Washington and Brussels charge the RSF has ties with Russia's Wagner mercenary group, which is fighting in Ukraine and has long been active in multiple African countries, including Libya where it backed Haftar. Wagner boss Yevgeny Prigozhin recently insisted that "for two years, not a single Wagner... fighter has been present in Sudan. And today there is none". Cameron Hudson, of the Center for Strategic and International Studies, said that "the Wagner group is not fighting in Sudan, but they have technical advisors".

The European Union in February imposed new sanctions against Wagner, accusing it of human rights abuses in Ukraine as well as Sudan, Mali and CAR. After major fighting erupted in Sudan in mid-April, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken voiced "deep concern about the engagement" of Wagner there, charging that the group "brings more death and destruction" wherever it operates.

Western diplomats have reported seeing groups of mercenaries frequently passing through Khartoum's airport and hotels since the CAR government in 2018 called on Wagner to help repress a rebellion.

Daglo's family has long controlled gold mines in Darfur and elsewhere in Sudan, Africa's third-largest producer of the precious metal that has also attracted the attention of Wagner.

The US Treasury has accused Prigozhin of operating shadow companies in Sudan that were awarded gold-mining concessions, and the latest EU sanctions also targeted gold companies linked to Wagner in Sudan.

For Daglo, gold has provided a revenue stream to

pay fighters, said Andreas Krieg, associate professor of security studies at King's College London. "The fact that Hemeti has access to quite a lot of gold wealth and avenues to bring it to market means he can pay salaries in a way that many in sub-Saharan Africa or the Sahel cannot," Krieg told AFP. "We had people from Chad join the RSF as well over the years

looking for salaries."

Hemeti hails from western Darfur's pastoralist Arab Rizeigat people and has family roots in Chad, with which Sudan shares a long and porous border. Sudanese militias have long padded their ranks by offering "Chadian Arabs access

to Sudanese citizenship and land abandoned by displaced non-Arabs", the Small Arms Survey research project found in 2017.

The RSF in its recent social media campaign has published videos of fighters in Chad and Niger voicing their support for them. While the RSF can draw on fighters from Chad and elsewhere, it is believed to receive weapons from Libya, analysts say.

Krieg said that areas under Haftar's control are now a likely "hub and node to deliver arms and supplies to the RSF". Weapons sent there in the past by the UAE "could now be proliferated with plausible deniability to the RSF", he said. — AFP

destruction," his relative said, standing beside the rubble. Medics said 190 people were wounded in Gaza.

UN Middle East envoy Tor Wennesland welcomed the truce and said he was "deeply saddened by the loss of life and injuries". Pope Francis said "weapons will not bring security and stability" to Zionists and Palestinians. "On the contrary, they will continue to destroy any hope of peace," the pontiff said during his Sunday address at the Vatican.

Sunday also saw the Zionist entity reopen its two crossings with Gaza, also paving the way for supplies of medicine, food and fuel to reach the impoverished territory. The closure had affected Palestinians with work permits or permission to access essential medical treatment not available in Gaza, which has been under a crippling Zionist-led blockade since Islamist group Hamas rose to power in 2007.

There are around 793,000 eligible voters in Kuwait.

While the Zionist entity and Islamic Jihad committed to the ceasefire, both warned they would not hesitate to resume fire if the other side violated the agreement. Tariq Salmi, an Islamic Jihad spokesman, said if the Zionist entity "commits any foolish act or any assassination... the resistance will resume where it left off".

There were multiple failed rounds of truce talks led by Egypt, sparking fears the conflict could escalate before a deal was reached, a diplomatic source close to the negotiations told AFP. Lebanese politician Bassel Al-Hassan was a "key facilitator" in contacting the Islamic Jihad leadership and getting the talks back on track, said the source, who was not authorized to speak publicly to the media.

Hassan chairs the Lebanese Palestinian Dialogue Committee, an inter-governmental agency which confirmed his "instrumental role" in facilitating talks between Islamic Jihad leader Ziyad Al-Nakhala and truce mediators. "We managed to make certain arrangements so that there was a communication channel with the UN and the Egyptians," said a committee official, requesting anonymity due to the sensitivities of the negotiations. — AFP

He previously told reporters that "one man, the army chief" was behind his arrest. But Khan distanced himself from the attacks against the military's installations at the protests, denying his party workers were involved and calling for an independent investigation into the violence. The army, which denies the accusations made by Khan, on Saturday warned against attempts to create "misperceptions" against the institution.

At least nine people died in the unrest this week, police and hospitals have said. Hundreds of police officers were injured and more than 4,000 people detained, mostly in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa provinces, according to authorities. At least 10 senior PTI leaders have been arrested since the protests began, one of Khan's lawyers said.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, the head of a shaky coalition, on Saturday warned that those involved in "facilitating, abetting and perpetrating" the violence should be arrested within 72 hours. "Those who demonstrated anti-state behavior will be arrested and tried in anti-terrorist courts," he said during a visit to Lahore. Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah has repeatedly vowed that police will re-arrest Khan, who remains wildly popular ahead of elections due in October.

The Islamabad High Court ruled that Khan should be given protection from arrest until Monday. "If Pakistan had a Doomsday Clock, it would be reading sixty seconds to midnight," read a Sunday editorial in Dawn, the country's leading English language newspaper. "There is a very real possibility that we may see the unleashing of total chaos if someone doesn't push the reset button," it said.

Khan won the 2018 election on an anti-corruption campaign, voted in by an electorate weary of decades of dynastic politics. Independent analysts say he was brought to power with the support of the military, before falling out with the generals. "Everyone knows who it is. It's the military behind (Khan's arrest)," 21-year-old PTI supporter Mohsin Khan told AFP outside the party chief's home. The pushcart seller added that he wanted the military and politicians "to work together".

The political crisis has simmered for months, with Khan attempting to disrupt the coalition government by dissolving two provincial parliaments he controlled and agitating for early elections. Mobile data services and access to social media platforms including Facebook and YouTube, which were cut shortly after Khan's arrest on Tuesday, had been partly restored around the country as of Saturday.—AFP

Thai polls close with army-backed prime minister tipped for defeat

Millions of Thais cast ballots at 95,000 polling stations scattered across the country

BANGKOK: Vote counting got under way in Thailand's general election Sunday with pro-democracy opposition parties tipped to defeat the conservative military-backed government of Prime Minister Prayut Chan-O-Cha after almost a decade in power. Opinion surveys pointed to a resounding defeat for ex-army chief and coup leader Prayut after a campaign that played out as a clash between a young generation yearning for change and the traditionalist, rovalist establishment.

The main opposition Pheu Thai party, fronted by the daughter of billionaire former premier Thaksin Shinawatra, was ahead in final opinion polls. But in a kingdom where victory at the ballot box has often been trumped by coups and court orders, there are fears the military could seek to cling on, raising the prospect of fresh instability.

Polling stations closed at 5:00 pm (1000 GMT) after a smooth day of voting, with no major problems reported by Thai media. Preliminary results are expected later in the evening, though the final number of seats won by each party will not be officially confirmed for several weeks.

After casting her ballot in Bangkok, Pheu Thai's main candidate Paetongtarn Shinawatra showed no signs of nerves. "Today is going to be a good day. I have very positive energy about it," the 36-year-old told reporters, smiling broadly.

Millions of Thais cast ballots at 95,000 polling stations scattered from the lush-forested mountains of the north to the idyllic sands of the southern beaches. A turnout of 90 percent in last Sunday's early round of voting pointed to an electorate looking for change, but the opposition faces an uphill battle to secure power, thanks to the junta-scripted 2017 constitution.

The new premier will be chosen jointly by the 500 elected MPs and 250 senate members appointed by Prayut's junta—stacking the deck in the army's favour. In the controversial last election in 2019, Prayut rode senate support to become prime minister at the head of a complex multi-party coalition.

Protest legacy

The election is the first since major youth-led pro-democracy protests erupted across Bangkok in 2020 with demands to curb the power and spending of Thailand's king—breaching a long-held taboo on questioning the monarchy.

The demonstrations petered out as COVID-19 curbs were imposed and dozens of leaders were arrested, but their energy has fuelled growing support for the more radical opposition Move Forward Party (MFP).

As he arrived to vote in Bangkok, MFP leader Pita Limjaroenrat, 42, said he expected a "historic turnout". "Younger generations these days care about their rights and they will come out to vote,' he told reporters.

While MFP is looking for support from millennial and Gen Z voters—who make up nearly half the 52 million-strong electorate—Pheu Thai's base is in the rural northeast where voters are still grateful for the welfare policies implemented by Thaksin in the early 2000s.

Prayut also urged voters to turn out in large numbers as he cast his ballot on Sunday. The former general has made an unashamedly nationalist pitch to older voters, painting himself as the only candidate capable of saving Thailand from chaos and ruin. But he has lagged badly in the polls, blamed for

a sputtering economy and feeble recovery from the pandemic, which battered the kingdom's crucial tourism industry. Voter Pakorn Adulpan, 85, said he was impressed by the quality of this year's contest.

"I am very hopeful because there is strong competition between many talented candidates,

compared to the elections in the past," he told AFP. Rights groups accuse Prayut of overseeing a major crackdown on basic freedoms, with a huge spike in prosecutions under Thailand's draconian royal defamation laws.

The country has seen a dozen coups in the last century and has been locked over the last two decades in a rolling cycle of street protests, coups and court orders dissolving political parties. The Shinawatra family's bitter tussle with the royalist-military establishment has been at the heart of the drama, with Thaksin ousted in a 2006 coup and his sister Yingluck unseated by Prayut in 2014.

An unclear or disputed result this time could lead to a fresh round of demonstrations and instability. Adding to the uncertainty, rumours are already swirling that MFP could be dissolved by court order—the same fate that befell its predecessor Future Forward Party after it performed unexpectedly well

Once results come in, attention will turn to the Electoral Commission, the judges and the generals to see what the next steps will be. — AFP

Ghana chooses Mahama for **2024** race

ACCRA: Ghana's largest opposition party chose the country's ex-president John Dramani Mahama as its flagbearer Sunday for the 2024 presidential election. Delegates of the National Democratic Congress (NDC) voted in primaries on Saturday through Sunday to choose a candidate for both the presidential and parliamentary polls.

Mahama was declared the overwhelming winner after polling 297,603, or 98.9 percent, of the votes while his challenger former Kumasi mayor Kojo Bonsu scored 3,181, or 1.1 percent. The primaries come as Ghana holds talks with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) over a \$3 billion bailout to help overcome an economic crisis, and as it faces a growing jihadist threat from a conflict in neighbouring Burkina Faso.

On Saturday, more than 355,000 NDC party delegates converged at 401 voting centres across the country for the ballot. Despite defeats in 2016 and 2020 elections by incumbent President Nana Akufo-Addo, 64-vear-old Mahama had been eyeing a return and had faced off with former central bank governor Kwabena **Duffuor and Bonsu**

But Duffuor withdrew from the race late on Friday, saying the party was not ready to conduct a "free and fair election". Mahama had already been tipped by most political analysts to win the primary, based on his experience and influence in the opposition party.

"He has been tried and tested and comes with a lot of experience," Kwame Asah-Asante, a political science lecturer at the University of Ghana, told AFP. "Mahama is the most marketable candidate in the party now. I don't see the delegates voting against him. The party stands a better chance of returning to power with Mahama than any other candidate.

Duffuor, also a former finance minister, has a large base in the Ashanti Region—the stronghold of the governing New Patriotic Party (NPP). He had reversed his decision earlier on Friday to place a court injunction on the primary race after expressing reservations about discrepancies in the electoral roll. — AFP

22 people killed in Somalia floods

BELEDWEYNE: Flash flooding in central Somalia has killed 22 people and affected over 450,000, the UN's humanitarian agency OCHA said Sunday, after the Shabelle River burst its banks, forcing tens of thousands out of their homes.

Heavy rainfall earlier in the week sent water gushing into homes in Beledweyne town in Hiran region, submerging roads and buildings as residents grabbed their belongings and waded through flooded streets in search of refuge.

"Initial estimates indicate that the flash and riverine floods across Somalia have affected at least 460,470 people, of whom nearly 219,000 have been displaced from their homes mainly in flood-prone areas, and 22 killed," the UN's Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs said.

The floods "have left a trail of destruction... inundating homes and farmland, washing away livestock,

temporarily closing schools and health facilities, and damaging roads," the agency said in a situation report. The disaster comes on the heels of a record drought that has left millions of Somalis on the brink of famine, with the troubled nation also battling an Islamist insurgency for decades.

Residents told AFP earlier that the floods have become a familiar ordeal to many of them, with experts saying that extreme weather events are happening with increased frequency and intensity due to climate change.

Fartun Ali -- not her real name -- said it was her fifth time fleeing flash flooding in Beledweyne. 'Whenever the river breaks the banks, we flee," the 35-year-old mother of eight told AFP. East and central Africa often suffers from extreme weather during the rainy seasons.

Earlier this month, 135 people were killed and more than 9,000 left homeless after heavy rains lashed Rwanda, triggering floods and landslides in several parts of the hilly nation. More than 400 people lost their lives due to torrential downpours, floods and landslides last week in the eastern Democratic Republic of Congo. — AFP

Iranians pushed to take up homegrown apps as net tightens

TEHRAN: Banned from using popular Western apps, Iranians have been left with little choice but to take up state-backed alternatives, as the authorities tighten internet restrictions for security reasons following months of protests. Iranians are accustomed to using virtual private networks, or VPNs, to evade restrictions and access prohibited websites or apps, including the US-owned Facebook, Twitter and YouTube.

The authorities went as far as imposing total internet blackouts during the protests that erupted after the September death of 22-year-old Mahsa Amini, following her arrest for an alleged breach of the Islamic republic's dress code for women. Connections are back up and running again, and even those who are tech-savvy are being corralled into using the apps approved by the authorities such as Neshan for navigation and Snapp! to hail a car ride. As many as 89 million people have signed up to Iranian messaging apps including Bale, Ita, Rubika and Soroush, the government says, but not everyone is keen on making the switch.

"The topics that I follow and the friends who I communicate with are not on Iranian platforms," said Mansour Roghani, a resident in the capital Tehran. "I use Telegram and WhatsApp and, if my VPN still allows me, I'll check Instagram," the former municipality employee

said, adding that he has not installed domestic apps as replacements. At the height of the deadly Amini protests in October, the Iranian government cited security concerns as it moved to restrict internet access and added Instagram and WhatsApp to its long list of blocked applications. "No one wants to limit the internet and we can have international platforms" if the foreign companies agree to introduce representative offices in Iran, Telecommunications Minister Issa Zarepour said last month. Meta, the American giant that owns Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp, has said it has no intention of setting up offices in the Islamic republic, which remains under crippling US sanctions. The popularity of the state-sanctioned apps may not be what it seems, however, with the government encouraging people to install them by shifting essential online public services to the homegrown platforms which are often funded by the state.

In addition, analysts say, Iranian users have online safety concerns when using the approved local apps.

"We have to understand they have needs," said Amir Rashidi, director of digital rights and security at the New York-based Miaan Group. "As an Iranian citizen, what would you do if registering for university is only based on one of these apps? Or what would you do if you need access to government services?", he said.

The locally developed apps lack a "clear privacy policy", according to software developer Keikhosrow Heydari-Nejat. "I have installed some of the domestic messaging apps on a separate phone, not the one that I am using every day," the 23-year-old said, adding he had done so to access online government services. "If they (government) shut the internet down, I will keep them in-

stalled but I will visit my friends in person," he said. In a further effort to push people onto the domestic



platforms, the telecommunications ministry connected the four major messaging apps, enabling users to communicate across the platforms. "Because the government is going for the maximum number of users, they are trying to connect these apps," the analyst Rashidi said, adding all of the domestic platforms "will enjoy

financial and technical support". Iran has placed restrictions on apps such as Facebook and Twitter since 2009, following protests over disputed presidential elections. In November 2019, Iran imposed nationwide internet restrictions during protests sparked by surprise fuel price hikes. — AFP

Senior Fed official says monetary policy is 'on track'

WASHINGTON: The US Federal Reserve is "on track" in its fight against inflation, with the full impact of its interest-rate hikes likely yet to be felt, a top Fed official said Friday. The US central bank has hiked its benchmark lending rate 10 times in quick succession since last year in a bid to tackle rising prices, which remain above its long-term target of two percent.

"We are 'doing what is necessary or expected' of us," Fed governor Philip Jefferson told a California conference in prepared remarks, referring to the Merriam-Webster dictionary definition of being "on track." "Furthermore, monetary policy affects the economy and inflation with long and varied lags, and the full effects of our rapid tightening are still likely ahead of us," he said.

Jefferson, who President Joe Biden nominated earlier Friday to become the next vice chair of the Fed, sounded a more optimistic note on inflation than two of his peers on the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC). This suggests policymakers on the FOMC are divided over the likelihood of a further interest-rate hike when the committee next convenes June 13-14. "Should inflation remain high and the labor market remain tight, additional monetary policy tightening will likely be appropriate," Fed governor Michelle Bowman told a conference in Germany earlier Friday.

On Tuesday, New York Fed President John Williams also left the door open to a further interest rate hike to combat inflation. "We haven't said we're done raising rates," he told the Economic Club of New York. "I think what we're going to need to do—as we always do—is be data dependent," he said. Futures traders see the probability of another rate hike on June 14 as slim, although the odds of further tightening have increased in recent days, according to data from CME Group. — AFP



IPO activity in MENA remains strong: EY report

KUWAIT: The Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region saw 10 IPOs with the combined proceeds of \$3.4 billion, an EY report showed this week, IPO activity in the MENA region retained strong momentum despite the weaker global sentiment, according to the EY MENA IPO Eye Q1 2023 report. This represents a 33 per cent drop in the number of listings and a 14 per cent decrease in value compared with Q1 2022.

Globally, Q1 2023 saw a total of 299 IPOs, raising \$21.5b – a 61 per cent decrease in volume year-on-year (YoY). This follows the trend for 2022, when IPO-bound companies and investors faced ongoing macroeconomic and geopolitical uncertainties, exacerbated by stress in the global banking system. IPO windows are short, and funding conditions are getting tougher, with investors prioritizing value over growth.

The MENA region, however, remains buoyant, with a promising pipeline for the rest of the year, driven by various enabling initiatives, such as the Abu Dhabi IPO Fund (ADIPOF). Six companies in Saudi Arabia have announced their listing plans on the Saudi Exchange (Tadawul) Main Market. "Volatility experienced in the MENA equity market during 2022 continued into Q1 2023 due to rising interest rates, inflation concerns, unexpected global banking turbulence and geopolitical uncertainties, which has impacted investor sentiment. At the end of the quarter, six out of the 10 MENA IPOs had a positive return compared to their IPO price, with Presight Al Holding PLC achieving the highest gain of 146.3 per cent," the report said.

US inflation stubborn and decelerating

KUWAIT: Looking at FX, the greenback ended the week on a strong footing as sticky inflation figures and expectations strengthened the case that rates might stay at current levels for longer. The EUR/USD currency pair broke below the 1.0900 level, last closing around 1.0848. Meanwhile, the GBP/USD currency pair broke below the 1.2500 mark following the release of mixed GDP data, closing the week around 1.2457. Finally, the USD/JPY currency pair traded below the 135.00 level, yet, it was able to recoup and was last seen trading around the 135.71 mark.

US inflation decelerates

The decelerating yet stubborn trend of inflation in the United States continues, after annual CPI for April came in at 4.9 percent versus a previous and consensus figure of

5.0 percent. Moreover, monthly CPI for both headline and core came in at 0.4 percent, in line with expectations. This is the 10th consecutive month where headline inflation has decreased. However, annual core CPI, which excludes food and energy, continues to show signs of stubbornness, as it remained unchanged at 5.5 percent. April's data showed further annual increases in the prices of used cars (4.4 percent), and shelter costs (8.1 percent) respectively. Furthermore, a 3 percent increase in gasoline costs helped boost the m/m energy index by 0.6 percent.

The Producer Price Index (PPI) in the United States rose 2.3 percent annually versus an expectation of 2.4 percent and a previous figure of 2.7 percent. Meanwhile, core PPI saw its 13th straight decline on an annual basis, with the print coming in at 3.2 percent versus a forecasted figure of 3.3 percent and a previous figure of 3.4 percent. Monthly figures saw both headline and core prints increasing by 0.2 percent. While the data shows a slowdown in inflation for producers, the most notable price increase was in the demand services sector, which was up 0.3 percent on the month marking it the largest such monthly increase since November 2022. Federal Reserve officials have previously stated that they are keeping a close eye

on the services sector of the economy, which has specifically been extremely stubborn when it comes to inflation and is expected to weigh in on key interest rate decisions.

Labor market softening or of Americans filing for

The number of Americans filing for unemployment benefits have hit highs not seen since October 2021, with 264k Americans filing for unemployment versus a consensus of 245k and a previous figure of 242k. Numbers within the 270k-300k range typically indicates a deteriorating labor market. The Federal Reserve, which is considering a potential pause after 10 consecutive rate hikes, have continuously lamented about the imbalance and stubbornness of the labor market. Signs of softening in the labor market will be a welcome sight for the Fed and could prove to be a key factor in deciding when to pause rate hikes.

Consumer sentiment in the US deteriorated in early May with the University of Michigan's (UoM) Preliminary Consumer Confidence Index falling to 57.7 from 63.5 in April. This reading came in below the market expectation of 63. Meanwhile, inflation expectations rose to 3.2 percent despite the current level of interest rates, meaningfully raising the probability of another Fed hike in June.

BoE hikes rates

The Bank of England raised interest rates by 25 bps taking key rates to 4.5 percent, the highest level seen since 2008. This represents the 12th consecutive hike as it attempts to fight stubborn inflation, which is currently the highest in the G7 at 10.1 percent, double the level of the United States and the eurozone. However, the focus is on whether the BoE would hold rates or hike even more for the remainder of this year after the most recent increase. Speaking on the decision to raise rates, Governor Andrew Bailey said that "we are approaching the point when we should be able to set to rest in terms of the level of rates." However, the central bank warned that "if there were to be evidence of more persistent pressures, then further tightening of monetary policy would be required." The United Kingdom's economy shrunk in March after the data showed a 0.3 percent contraction versus a previous and consensus of no change. Despite this, first quarter GDP showed an increase of 0.1 percent, in line with expectations.

Saudi builds largest grains storage capacity in Mideast

RIYADH: Saudi Arabia has built the largest advanced grain storage capacity in the Middle East, increasing the total by 40 percent from 2.5 million tons in 2016 to 3.5 million tons. The Ministry of Environment, Water, and Agriculture (MEWA) revealed in a report that the system has record achievements in the agricultural sector as part of its strategies to achieve Saudi Vision 2023.

According to the report, the ministry's efforts had a clear impact on recording the highest domestic product in the sector's history, indicating that achieving food security in the Kingdom is one of the priorities of the system that finds unlimited support from the government. The report emphasized that the Saudi food security strategy provided a model for maintaining the stability of food supply chains during crises and in areas of cooperation with the private sector.

The strategy, supervised by the General Food Security Authority (GFSA), empowered the private sector by fully privatizing the mills after restructuring, distributing them to four independent companies, and transferring their ownership, worth about \$1.5 billion. It also included a national program to reduce food waste, setting the baseline for the food loss index at 33.1 percent.

The strategy developed organic agriculture by raising production at a rate of 79.5 percent, from 56.26 thousand tons in 2016 to 101,000 tons. The report indicated that the Ministry's efforts also increased self-sufficiency in several agricultural and animal products, which enhances food security and safety. The Ministry boasts several international achievements, including the Guinness World Record for the longest agricultural trip in the world after the agricultural guidance convoy, dispatched by the Ministry, crossed 8,320 kilometers. The report explained that the government support programs were a significant reason for the Kingdom's topping global positions in many fields, including the first rank in dates exports.

Saudi Arabia also won the World Summit Award and topped the Information Society for 2022 in the category of digital agriculture and electronic ser-

vices provided through the Nama portal. According to the report, the system is moving towards achieving food security and sustainable agricultural development within strategies, plans, programs, and initiatives to achieve citizens' well-being and prosperity. It also supports farmers, livestock breeders, and poultry and fish producers to provide safe food and sustainable infrastructure. —Agencies

Vietnam shoemaker for Nike, Adidas cuts 6,000 jobs

HANOI: One of Vietnam's largest shoe manufacturers for brands such as Nike and Adidas will cut thousands of workers at the end of next month, blaming a slump in orders, state media said Saturday. The country is among the world's largest exporters of clothing, footwear and furniture, but has been badly affected by the cost-of-living crisis in Europe and the United States, with the buying power of worldwide consumers shrinking.

PouYuen Vietnam, a unit of Taiwan-based Pou Chen Group, told local authorities it would lay off almost 6,000 workers with permanent contracts from the end of next month, VNExpress reported.

'This will be the biggest layoff since PouYuen started its operation in Ho Chi Minh City in 1996," the state media outlet said. The firm is among the commercial capital's largest employers, with an estimated 50,000 workers. But it made a similar move in February letting go almost 3,000 permanent staff, and a further 3,000 temporary employees did not have their contracts renewed.

A third of production facilities in the city experienced reduced workforce demand in the first quarter of the year, according to a survey by Ho Chi Minh City's labour department. The downturn mostly impacted shoes, clothing, construction and food processing industries, officials said. PouYuen put 20,000 of its workers on paid leave in rotation last year. More than 630,000 workers lost their jobs or had their hours cut in Vietnam last year, according to the labor ministry. — AFP

weden won the Eurovision Song Contest early Sunday, as singer Loreen beat out 25 competitors in the finale of the world's biggest live music event, hosted by Britain on behalf of war-torn Ukraine.

A previous victor in 2012, Loreen is the first woman to win the eccentric, muchloved competition twice and only the second person to do so after Johnny Logan for Ireland in the 1980s.

It is a record-equalling seventh Eurovision crown for Sweden, and means the Scandinavian nation will host next year's contest on the 50th anniversary of ABBA's win -- the country's first -- with breakthrough hit "Waterloo".

Loreen -- real name Lorine Talhaoui -told reporters that her victory with dancepop track, "Tattoo", felt "surreal" and "so beautiful", and had left her "seriously overwhelmed". Born in Sweden to parents of Moroccan Berber origin, the 39-year-old's win for Sweden over 25 other countries competing in the final was celebrated in her homeland. "It feels wonderful," she said.

She narrowly triumphed over Finland's Kaarija after the public and jury votes were combined following an evening of typically eclectic musical acts in Liverpool. Third place went to Zionist entity, with Noa Kirel's "Unicorn", as more than 160 million estimated viewers watched on television around the world.

War and peace

Sweden and Finland had been the bookmakers' favourites heading into the contest beloved for its kitschy, quirky performances.

Sweden's biggest broadsheet Dagens Nyheter on Sunday hailed Loreen's victory an "enormous, unbelievable feat", praising her ability to touch audiences "like few others do". "She's a strange combination of vague and ethereal," it mused.

Rapper Kaarija, representing Finland, came a close second after a memorable performance of "Cha Cha Cha", delivered in his distinctive green

bolero-style jacket with spikes around the neck, which has become a craze in his homeland.

The home crowd went wildest for the UK's entry, Mae Muller, who flopped in the vote count.

Britain's Sam Ryder, runner-up in 2022, performed his latest song -- with Queen's Roger Taylor on drums -- during the voting for this year's

spectacle.

He was pipped to the coveted glass microphone trophy by last year's winners, Ukraine's Kalush Orchestra, who also reappeared Saturday to kickstart the night.

The band performed in a pre-recorded video -featuring a surprise appearance by the Princess of Wales, Kate, playing the piano -- and also gave a live performance.

Although there was the usual riot of colour, camp and unbridled joy, several of the contest's songs evoked the Ukraine war. Switzerland's young singer Remo Forrer conveyed a message of peace with his track "Watergun".

Meanwhile, Croatia's extravagantly moustachioed Let 3 performed "Mama SC", seen as a veiled attack on Russian President Vladimir Putin and "human stupidity".

Politics preceded the finale, with a row erupting Friday over a proposed appearance by Volodymyr Zelensky.

For fear of politicising the event, the European Broadcasting Union refused an invitation for the Ukrainian president to send a message.

That came despite Russia being barred from participating and the overtly political message of some songs, and prompted criticism from the UK government.—AFP



Ukrainian Eurovision act's hometown bombed during final performance

s Ukraine's Eurovision act Tvorchi delivered a thumping bass under strobing yellow and blue lights in Liverpool on Saturday night, air raid sirens back in their hometown Ternopil were signalling the latest Russian assault.

Moments after the electronic duo finished performing, they posted on Instagram that Ternopil was under attack.

"Our hometown...was bombed by Russia while we sang on the Eurovision stage about our steel hearts, indomitability and will," Tvorchi posted, dedicating their performance to "all cities of Ukraine that are shelled every day."

"Europe, unite against evil for the sake of peace!"

The duo's song, "Heart of Steel", was inspired by Ukrainian attempts to resist a months-long siege at the Azovstal steel factory in Mariupol.

At one point during the show, the black sunglass-wearing musicians held up a handwritten sign saying "Ternopil" while a group around them waved Ukraine's blue and yellow flags.

The head of Ternopil's regional military administration Volodymyr Trush said early Sunday morning that two people were injured in the strike, which sparked fires at warehouses owned by commercial and religious groups.

"Two civilians were injured. Preliminary, shrapnel wounds and burns. The victims are in hospitals," Trush posted on Telegram.

Firefighters were still battling the blaze at the time of his post and he said that "specialists will be at the scene all night."

Tvorchi -- composed of 27-year-old producer Andriy Hutsuliak and 25-year-old vocalist Jimoh Augustus Kehinde -- is no stranger to Russian fire.

At the end of April, hours after a massive shelling, air raid sirens forced them to take shelter in a cellar when they were due to perform in Kyiv's main rail station.

After the alert, the group surprised passengers with an impromptu performance in the entrance hall of the vast Stalin-era station.

On Saturday, Sweden won the campy Eurovision Song Contest, succeeding Ukraine's Kalush Orchaestra, which was victorious last year with a "Stefania", a song mixing hip-hop and local folk music.

Because of the Russian invasion, Ukraine was unable to organise the 67th edition of the contest and the Beatles' hometown Liverpool hosted instead.—AFP

Palou wins IndyCar GMR GP

WASHINGTON: Alex Palou of Chip Ganassi Racing won IndyCar's GMR Grand Prix at Indianapolis on Saturday to take over at the top of the championship standings. Spain's Palou won by 16.8 seconds from Arrow McLaren's Pato O'Ward with Arrow's Alexander Rossi finishing third. Denmark's Christian Lundgaard, who had claimed his first IndyCar pole, had to settle for a season-best fourth place finish on the road course at Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Starting third on the grid, Palou's first victory of the season came after he made a decisive start, powering his Honda into first place on the opening lap. Making smart use of tire changes, Palou then took control when he overtook Lundgaard on Lap 42 to grab a lead which he never looked in danger of losing. Palou praised his team for their pit and tire strategies including starting on the Firestone alternate "red" tires. —AFP

NBA Suns fire Williams

LOS ANGELES: Monty Williams, last season's NBA Coach of the Year, has been fired as coach of the Phoenix Suns after their second-round playoff loss to Denver, the team said on Saturday. Williams went 194-115 in four seasons with the Suns, but was dumped only two days after the Denver Nuggets ousted the Suns 4-2 in their best-of-seven Western Conference series. "We are filled with gratitude for everything Monty has contributed to the Suns and to the Valley community," said Suns president of basketball operations James Jones in a tweet confirming multiple reports of the firing. The visiting Nuggets prevailed 125-100 in a must-win game for the Suns, who trailed by 30 points at halftime. New Suns owner Mat Ishbia, who reportedly made the decision to fire Williams on Saturday, made a blockbuster deal just after taking over the team, obtaining Kevin Durant from the Brooklyn Nets at the February trade deadline. —AFP

Shakib ruled out for 6 weeks

DHAKA: Bangladesh all-rounder Shakib Al Hasan has been ruled out for around six weeks with a finger injury, the cricket board said on Sunday. Shakib hurt the tip of his right index finger attempting a catch during Friday's second one-day international against Ireland at Chelmsford, England, the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) said. "An X-ray today (Saturday) confirmed a fracture on the base of the index finger. Such injuries usually take around six weeks to heal," national team physio Bayjedul Islam Khan said. The injury means Shakib is not available for Sunday's final ODI against Ireland. Bangladesh currently lead the three-match series 1-0. They won Friday's second match by three wickets, knocking off a target of 320 runs after the opening match of the series was rained off. Sunday's ODI against Ireland is the final fixture of the ICC ODI Super League in the current cycle. —AFP

Leeds fan charged with assault

LONDON: A Leeds fan who confronted Newcastle manager Eddie Howe during Saturday's Premier League clash has been charged with assault by West Yorkshire Police. Leeds have banned the supporter for life after he climbed out of the stands at Elland Road and entered the technical area where the altercation with Howe took place. The man appeared to push Howe and shout at him before he was led away by stewards. West Yorkshire Police on Sunday confirmed that the man has been charged with assault and will appear before magistrates in July. "Police have charged a man with assault and entering the field of play following an incident at Elland Road football stadium during the Leeds United versus Newcastle United football match yesterday," a statement said. "The man has been bailed to appear before magistrates on 21 July." —AFP

Moloney wins world crown

LOS ANGELES: Australia's Jason Moloney won his first world title on Saturday, taking a majority decision over Vincent Astrolabio of the Philippines for the vacant World Boxing Organization bantamweight crown. The 32-year-old from Melbourne won on judges' scores of 115-113 and 116-112 with the third judge scoring a 114-114 draw in the showdown at Stockton, California. Moloney improved to 26-2, suffering his only losses in his two prior world title bouts, falling to Puerto Rico's Emmanuel Rodriguez in 2018 and Japan's Naoya Inoue in 2020. Astrolabio, 26, fell to 18-4. Also on the card, WBO middleweight champion Janibek Alimkhanuly of Kazakhstan knocked out Canada's Steven Butler at 2:35 of the second round to defend his crown for the first time. After stunning the challenger with a left uppercut, Alimkhanuly pummeled Butler again and again with lefts, dropping him to the canavas three times before referee Jack Reiss stopped the onslaught.—AFP

Riner wins 11th judo title

DOHA: French judo star Teddy Riner won a record-extending 11th individual judo world championship title in Doha on Saturday, six years after his last, as he gears up for the 2024 Paris Olympics. The 34-year-old beat Russian Inal Tasoev in the +100kg final to become the oldest world champion in history. "I really hope it will come off (again) at Paris 2024 but it can only come off when you have days like that," he said. "It's been a long time since I heard the Marseillaise (French national anthem) on a world podium, it feels good." Riner dispatched world number one Temur Rakhimov in 30 seconds in the semi-finals, but needed overtime to defeat Tasoev by waza-ari. "I think it's one of the biggest days of my entire career," he added. "No rhythm all day, so what do we use? The mind, that's all that's left." —AFP

Punjab, Lucknow boost IPL play-off hopes; Delhi out

Prabhsimran, Brar shine as Punjab end Delhi's IPL hopes

NEW DELHI: Opener Prabhsimran Singh hit his maiden IPL century to set up a 31-run win for Punjab Kings and push Delhi Capitals out of the play-off race on Saturday, while Lucknow Super Giants beat Sunrisers Hyderabad by seven wickets. Sunrisers batsman Heinrich Klaasen was docked 10 percent of his match fee for showing dissent after a controversial no-ball call that sparked the home crowd to shout abuse at the Lucknow dug-out.

The match was briefly stopped as the umpires spoke to the Lucknow bench, including an animated coach Andy Flower, whose team moved back into the top four. In the second game of the day, Punjab kept their play-off hopes alive after Prabhsimran hit 103 off 65 balls and guided his team to 167-7. Harpreet Brar then returned figures of 4-30 with his left-arm spin as Delhi suffered a collapse to end on 136-8 despite a strong start from skipper David Warner, who hit 54 off 27 balls.

Romero wins on controversial 9th round stoppage

LOS ANGELES: American Rolando Romero defeated Venezuela's Ismael Barroso on a controversial ninth-round stoppage to win the vacant World Boxing Association super lightweight title on Saturday. Referee Tony Weeks stopped the bout at 2:41 of the ninth round in Las Vegas, Nevada, with Romero swinging but not landing against Barroso in the corner. "He was a warrior. He wanted to keep going. He should have been able to keep going," Romero said after the victory. "I wanted to keep going. He wanted to keep going. We both wanted to keep going."

Instead, Romero improved to 15-1 with his 13th victory inside the distance, capturing a world crown in his debut at the 140-pound division. Barroso, a 40-year-old southpaw, fell to 24-4 with two drawn, missing a chance to become only the 10th boxer to win a world title past his 40th birthday. "I think it was an injustice to stop this fight," Barroso said through a translator. "I was giving the best shots."

Romero, 28, was knocked down for only the second time in his career by a punishing left to the head from Barroso late in the third round. "I boxed the entire time," Romero said. "I came in a little cold, I got cracked and I finished the round like a champion and I kept going and I got the victory." Romero was somewhat inactive for several rounds, being careful to avoid more punishing shots, the South American landing another hard left to Romero's head in the sixth.

"I took my time, moved around. The man is strong.

"The way we brought the game back was amazing," Punjab skipper Shikhar Dhawan said. "Credit goes to the spinners and then the fast bowlers for closing it out." Punjab moved to sixth in the 10-team table led by holders Gujarat Titans. Delhi remain bottom of the heap and are out of the running. Warner seemed to have taken the game away with his power hitting but Brar led the spin charge, removing Phil Salt for 21 as Delhi slipped from 69-0 to 88-6. Leg-spinner Rahul Chahar joined in to trap Mitchell Marsh lbw before Brar struck twice in an over to dismiss Rilee Rossouw and Warner, who registered his 60th IPL fifty. Warner said his team had "found the right combination" during the tournament after a nightmare start.

'Wrong decision'

In Hyderabad, Indian batsman Prerak Mankad's 64 and a series of key partnerships including an unbeaten 58-run stand with Nicholas Pooran, who hit a

13-ball 44, steered the team's successful chase of 183 with four balls to spare. Mankad first set the pace with a 73-run partnership with Marcus Stoinis, who hit a 25-ball 40. Mankad raced to his maiden IPL fifty before West Indies international Pooran smashed three consecutive sixes in a 31-run over to start his sparkling innings.

Earlier, Hyderabad's Abdul Samad, who hit an unbeaten 37 in a 58-run stand with Klaasen, received a waist-high delivery that was called a no-ball by the on-field umpire but overturned on review. The delivery appeared to be above the batsman's waist but the review went in Lucknow's favor, cancelling out the run and the free hit, with the home crowd venting their anger. "Disappointed by the crowd to be honvest, that's not what you want," said Klaasen after his 29-ball knock. "That also broke the momentum, not great umpiring either, but you can't take matters in your own hands." — AFP

NAIROBI: American sprint star Sha'Carri Richardson signaled her return to form with an easy win in the women's 200m at the Kip Keino Classic in Nairobi on Saturday while local sensation Ferdinand Omanyala streaked to a world-leading time this year in the 100m. Already the fastest woman in the world this year in the 100m, the 23-year-old American obliterated the field to win in a new meet time of 22.07 seconds. Her victory in the 200m came a week after she won the 100m in a world-leading 10.76 seconds at the season-opening Diamond League

"The race was amazing. I came here to Kenya

jlaa Al-Jraiwi, Loula Al-Rifai and Fatima Al-Ghanim knowing that I have no excuse but to do my best," said Richardson, who missed the 2020 Tokyo Olympics after testing positive for cannabis at the US trials. Dortmund stun Gladbach to stay on Bayern's heels

Bayern demolish Schalke 6-0

DORTMUND: A stunning first-half performance from Sebastien Haller helped Borussia Dortmund move back within a point of Bundesliga leaders Bayern Munich with two matches remaining after a 5-2 thrashing of Borussia Moenchengladbach on Saturday. After Bayern demolished Schalke 6-0 earlier in the day, Dortmund struck four times in the opening 32 minutes against Gladbach, with Haller having a hand in each of the goals.

"We showed today that we will keep believing until the end and we will chase everything until the end," said Dortmund coach Edin Terzic. "We still have two games, after that we will see whether it was enough. Bayern have to step on the gas and we will as well."

Haller unleashed a shot after five minutes, with Donyell Malen pouncing on the rebound, scoring his eighth goal in his last eight matches. Haller was then brought down in the box, with England teenager Jude Bellingham converting from the spot to double Dortmund's lead. Haller got a goal of his own just three minutes later, superbly backheeling in a cross from Malen. The Dutchman set up Haller again shortly after, giving Dortmund a 4-0 lead.

Gladbach's Ramy Bensebaini, who is rumored to be headed to Dortmund next season, converted a penalty with 15 minutes remaining and Lars Stindl curled in another for the visitors, but US forward Gio Reyna scored a fifth to seal the result. The victory kept Dortmund right behind Bayern, who recorded their biggest win under Thomas Tuchel by putting six goals past struggling Schalke. Veteran Bayern captain Thomas Mueller slotted in after 21 minutes, his first goal in eight matches. Joshua Kimmich doubled Bayern's lead shortly after, converting a penalty despite losing his footing after Jamal Musiala copped an arm in the box.

Serge Gnabry added two more early in the second half, with French teenager Mathys Tel also scoring before Noussair Mazraoui chalked up his first goal in Bayern colors. "We made a step in the right direction—our buried self confidence is coming back," said Tuchel. "But there's no reason for euphoria, we'll be tested again on Saturday (against RB Leipzig)." The loss leaves Schalke, who had climbed out of the relegation places for the first time since September with last week's win at Mainz, in the relegation playoff spot.

Union 'keep dreaming'

Union Berlin solidified their hopes of a first Champions League appearance, leapfrogging RB Leipzig into third and going three clear of fifth-placed Freiburg with a 4-2 home win over the Black Forest side. Union set up the victory with a first-half blitz, Sheraldo Becker scoring twice in two minutes after Kevin Behrens opened the scoring with five minutes gone. Freiburg's Manuel Gulde pulled one back 10 minutes into the second half and a comeback looked on when Vincenzo Grifo chipped in from the spot with 20 minutes remaining. Becker however snuffed out the visitors' hopes, collecting the ball on the break and finding an unmarked Aissa Laidouni who knocked in Union's fourth.

"The fans can keep dreaming," said an elated Union coach Urs Fischer. "We had to go for it today." Eintracht Frankfurt won their first game in 11 tries despite coach Oliver Glasner's stadium ban, thrashing Mainz 3-0 at home, thanks to goals from Dai-

themselves past the Royal Blues out of the relegation places by a single point. Wolfsburg responded from last week's 6-0 thrashing by Dortmund to beat Hoffenheim 2-1 at home, moving into sixth place, the Europa Conference League spot. The loss leaves Hoffenheim just two points clear of the relegation spots with two games to play. — AFP

PSG edge closer to title as Messi jeered on return

PARIS: Paris Saint-Germain closed in on a record 11th French league title with a 5-0 home win over Ajaccio on Saturday as Lionel Messi received a mixed reception on his return from suspension. Fabian Ruiz opened the scoring on 22 minutes at the Parc des Princes and Achraf Hakimi added a second goal before Kylian Mbappe struck twice shortly after half-time. Mohamed Youssouf compounded a miserable night for the Corsicans with an own goal for PSG's fifth, while Hakimi and Ajaccio midfielder Thomas Mangani were sent off after a late bust-up.

PSG need four points from their final three games - against Auxerre, Strasbourg and Clermont - to secure the Ligue 1 title after restoring their six-point lead over second-placed Lens. "The players were very determined to put in a proper display. They want to be champions and they realise that Lens aren't giving up and a misstep could raise the pressure," said PSG coach Christophe Galtier.

Messi's name elicited a combination of whistles and applause when it was read out before kick-off

after he was banned by the club for last weekend's match over an unauthorized trip to Saudi Arabia. The Argentine again drew jeers with his early touches in what was likely his penultimate appearance in Paris ahead of a reported move to Saudi Arabia for the seven-time Ballon d'Or winner.

"So there are whistles but very quickly a large part of the stadium made sure to drown them out to support Leo," said Galtier. "He stayed focused with the desire to liven up the game and create chances. He's used to it because he's been in difficult situations in his career." Three defeats in their past four home games for PSG had allowed Lens to stay in an unlikely title race, but Ajaccio offered little resistance as their relegation to Ligue 2 was confirmed.

Danilo's threaded pass was flicked into the path of Ruiz and the Spain midfielder took a couple of smart touches before finishing clinically for his second goal in as many games. Hakimi then swept in the rebound after Mbappe's effort was parried by Francois-Joseph Sollacaro, with the goal allowed to stand despite the France striker using his arm to control in the build-up. Mbappe hit the 25-goal mark for the fourth time early in the second half, slotting beyond Sollacaro after a scramble in the box to take over again as the league's top scorer this term.

ROME: Inter Milan warmed up for their Champions League semi-final showdown with AC Milan with an entertaining 4-2 win over Sassuolo on Saturday while their city rivals floundered 2-0 at Serie A strugglers Spezia. A Romelu Lukaku brace on his 30th birthday, a further strike from Lautaro Martinez and an unfortunate Ruan Tressoldi own goal were enough for Inter to claim a seventh straight win in all competitions and move level on 66 points with second-placed Juventus.

"The coach told us the game was a match-point for the top four, and we're in good shape as we've been winning a lot of games recently," said Lukaku to Sky Sport. "We can still win two trophies and on Tuesday we have a very difficult match against the team that won the league last season." Inter hold a 2-0 lead over Milan ahead of Tuesday's second leg and Simone Inzaghi's side look almost certain to reach their first Champions League final since they last won it in 2010.

Their chances of qualifying for next season's edition of Europe's top club competition were also greatly improved by Saturday's win, which came after top four rivals Lazio, Milan and Atalanta all dropped points. Inter are five points ahead of fifth-placed Milan but after looking like they were going to cruise to the win they didn't end up having it their own way. Lukaku put Inter ahead with a rasping effort shortly before the break after both Domenico Berardi and Joaquin Correa both had goals ruled out for offside.

Ten minutes after the restart Tressoldi headed Raoul Bellanova's cross into his own net and the match seemed over three minutes later when Martinez's effort was deflected in again by Tressoldi. Headers from Matheus Henrique and Davide Frattesi pulled Sassuolo back into the game until Lukaku finally sealed the points with a fine low finish with two minutes remaining. Przemyslaw Wisniewski and Salvatore Esposito struck their first Serie A goals in the final 15 minutes to sink Milan and give Spezia their first win in two months. Leonardo Semplici's team are still in the relegation zone but Saturday's win moves them level on 30 points with Verona, who sit one place above the bottom three and host Torino on Sunday. — AFP

Rangers dampen Celtic celebration

GLASGOW: Rangers dampened Celtic's Scottish Premiership title celebrations by ending a six-game winless run against their Glasgow rivals with a 3-0 victory on Saturday. Todd Cantwell, John Souttar and Fashion Sakala scored the goals as Michael Beale secured his first Old Firm win as Rangers boss. "It's been a tough season overall for the fans and that one today should send them home with a bit more oxygen and optimism for what it going to be an exciting summer at the football club," said Beale. "If we can bring that energy from the stands, I'll push the boys on the pitch to bring the same energy and then next season we can give ourselves a big chance to do something we can really be proud of."

Celtic retained their title with four games to spare last weekend but defeat means Ange Postecoglou's men now cannot set a new club record points tally. The roles were reversed from previous meetings between the sides this season as Celtic paid for a slow start and a failure to take their chances. "It was a disappointing day for us. We never really got going," said Celtic boss Postecoglou, who gave some of his fringe players a chance to shine.

"We had a couple of really good opportunities to get back in the game and we let ourselves down in those areas." Cantwell smashed home the opener just five minutes in after Joe Hart parried John Lundstram's fierce strike. The visitors should have been level immediately as Oh Hyeon-gyu hit the post when one-on-one with Robby McCrorie. Liel Abada also missed a glorious chance to equalize before Rangers doubled their lead through Souttar's header

Man City move closer to title

West Ham miss chance to seal survival in defeat at Brentford

LIVERPOOL: Manchester City closed in on retaining the Premier League title as Ilkay Gundogan scored twice in a 3-0 win on Sunday that kept Everton looking over their shoulders in the relegation battle. Pep Guardiola's men move four points clear of Arsenal, who are in action later at home to Brighton, with three games remaining for both sides. City's superior goal difference means five points from their remaining matches will likely be enough for a fifth title in six seasons.

Everton remain just one point outside the relegation zone and could slip into the bottom three if Leicester beat Liverpool on Monday. By contrast to the Toffees' troubles, City are still well on course for a treble and could afford the luxury of an afternoon off for some of their stars ahead of Wednesday's Champions League semi-final, second leg against Real Madrid. Guardiola made four changes from the side that drew 1-1 in the first leg in the Spanish capital on Tuesday with John Stones, Bernardo Silva, Kevin De Bruyne and Jack Grealish left on the bench.

It took the visitors 35 minutes to find their rhythm, by which point they should have been behind as Mason Holgate somehow spooned over a glorious chance to open the scoring after James Tarkowski headed down a corner. Within three minutes of Holgate's sitter, the game was over as a contest. Guardiola had stern words for Gundogan despite the German scoring twice in last weekend's 2-1 win over Leeds after the midfielder missed a late penalty having been given the chance to complete his hat-trick by Erling Haaland.

Gundogan made amends with a stunning touch to control and then flick home Riyad Mahrez's cross in one movement to break the deadlock. Moments later, he created the second with a floated cross that invited Haaland to power home his 52nd goal of the season with just his third touch in 39 minutes. Everton boss Sean Dyche showed he too was already thinking about his side's final two games of the season by replacing talismanic striker Dominic Calvert-Lewin, who has missed most of the season through injury, with Neal Maupay at half-time. Guardiola could not have wished for a more serene second half to

prepare for the visit of the European champions in midweek as another moment of brilliance from Gundogan made it 3-0 six minutes after the restart. The 32-year-old is probably into the final month of his seven-year stay in Manchester with his contract up at the end of the season and Barcelona reportedly ready to pounce on a free transfer, but looks set to go out on a high.

Gundogan curled a free-kick beyond the desperate dive of Jordan Pickford for his ninth goal of the season. Goal difference could be decisive in the battle to beat the drop and Everton did at least manage to stop the bleeding at three. Indeed the home side came closest to scoring in the final quarter when Amadou Onana's header came crashing back off the crossbar.

West Ham miss chance

West Ham wasted a chance to seal their Premier League survival as goals from Bryan Mbeumo and Yoane Wissa clinched Brentford's 2-0 victory on Sunday. David Moyes' side would have been guaranteed to avoid relegation with a victory in west London. But Mbeumo and Wissa netted in the first half to leave the Hammers still needing one win from their last two games to be sure of staying up.

West Ham are six points clear of third bottom Leeds, who have just two matches left. However, second bottom Leicester would move within four points of the east Londoners if they beat Liverpool on Monday. With games against relegation rivals Leeds and Leicester to come in their remaining fixtures this was a missed opportunity for West Ham to put their lingering relegation fears to bed. West Ham are dreaming of a first major trophy since the 1980 FA Cup after beating AZ Alkmaar 2-1 in the Europa Conference League semi-final first leg on Thursday.

But they have now only won one of the seven topflight matches that have come within three days of them playing in Europe this season. Moyes had made nine changes with Thursday's second leg at Alkmaar looming. Declan Rice and Jarrod Bowen dropped to the bench, with Michail Antonio missing out due to a calf injury. The gamble backfired and Brentford's lively

start was rewarded in the 20th minute as a flowing move cut through the West Ham defense.

Mathias Jensen's pin-point pass teed up Mbeumo and he caressed a cool finish past Lukasz Fabianski. Brentford had lost just once when opening the scoring this season, while West Ham had only one victory when conceding the first goal. There looked little chance of those sequences reversing as Brentford kept up the pressure. Damsgaard spotted Aaron Hickey's run into the area and the defender squared for Wissa, whose low strike was saved by Fabianski.

It was a warning West Ham failed to heed as Wissa doubled the Bees' lead in the 43rd minute.

Jensen's long throw was flicked on by Ben Mee and Wissa headed powerfully past Fabianski. Danny Ings' shot was pushed away for a corner by David Raya in a rare moment of menace from West Ham. Wissa fired wide after a sloppy mistake from Tomas Soucek that summed up West Ham's lethargic display. Mikkel Damsgaard should have made it three for Brentford but he volleyed over after Jensen's corner was flicked on by Mee. — AFP
