# Sheikh Mishal named 17th Amir

# New leader has worked to ensure bright future for Kuwait

KUWAIT: His Highness Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah has been proclaimed Kuwait's new Amir to become the country's 17th ruler, in line with the Emirate's Succession Law, succeeding the late Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. His Highness Sheikh Mishal has been declared the Amir of Kuwait following a regular process of succession to the Amir's post, a recurrence of the power transfer by the previous

The newly-proclaimed Amir is one of the extraordinary men who were raised by the gracious Al-Sabah family, learning leadership skills from the sagacious seniors and the family's shrewd politicians. HH Sheikh Mishal, over the past three years, has been the trusted top supporter of His Highness the Amir, partaking in decision-making, taking over the state leadership in his absence, bearing part of the responsibilities' heavy burden, leading the country to be among the developed states, bolstering its security and prosperity.

The newly-designated Kuwait Amir had served in a number of security and military posts, including senior positions in the Ministry of Interior, the National Guards, and representing the top rulers on official occasions and during various diplomatic and political missions. HH Sheikh Mishal, born in Kuwait in 1940, is the seventh son of Kuwait's 10th Ruler, Sheikh Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Mubarak Al-Sabah, who governed the country between 1921 and

In his early childhood, he was taught reading and writing by his parents and some seniors in the family before joining Al-Mubarakiya School, the first private school in Kuwait at the time. He continued higher-level studies in the UK, where he graduated from Hendon Police College in 1960. After returning home, he joined the newly-established Ministry of Interior. In 1987, he was appointed public inspection chief with a colonel's rank and remained in the department for up

special session of the National Assembly, where he took the constitutional oath in front of the MPs after a swearing-in ceremony in front of the late Amir, according to the Emirate Succession Law and Kuwait Constitution. Addressing the MPs, HH Sheikh Mishal said during the session that public participation would be part of his ruling policy and pledged to boost a spirit of amity, tolerance, and divisions' renunciaConstitution and justice. HH Sheikh Mishal has always advocated bolstering cooperation between the executive and legislative authorities to attain the aspired goals, taking agile steps to attain the

objectives of the sagacious leadership and the Kuwaiti people, and that is through development in the key sectors.

HH Sheikh Mishal, after the proclamation, devoted much of his attention to local affairs amid shutdowns witnessed throughout the world after the flare-up of the Coronavirus. He followed up on measures to minimize the effects of the pandemic at the domestic level. In this vein, he guided various authorities and associations to perform the special tasks. HH Sheikh Mishal has regularly held meetings with ordinary citizens who would express complaints or talk about their needs.

At the Gulf level, HH Sheikh Mishal has adopted his predecessors' path, keenly cementing relations with brotherly countries and cooperating with their leaders regarding regional issues and Arab and global affairs, namely the need to maintain security and stability in the Gulf and tackling occasional rifts among the regional countries. Following the steps of his predecessors, HH Sheikh Mishal has maintained close relations with Arab states, and his efforts at this level were tangibly fruitful, particularly with respect to strengthening the Arabs' ranks. In addition to the posts he had occupied, HH Sheikh Mishal was granted honorary positions. He was designated as an honorary chairper-

son of the Kuwait Aircraft Engineers and Pilots Association (1973–2017). Moreover, he was a co-founder and the honorary head of the Kuwait Association for Wireless Amateurs. In 1977, the late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah named HH Sheikh Mishal the chairman of Al-Nabat Poets Diwaniya. On December 4, 2018, the French Minister of the Armed Forces, Florence Barely, decorated him with the Legion of Honor Medal for his prime role in developing Kuwait and establishing solid ties with Paris.— KUNA

#### Saudi Arabia

# Flags to fly half-mast for 40 days

# Ministries, government institutions, banks close for three days

KUWAIT: Kuwait lowered its national flag Saturday, declaring a 40-day period of official mourning, grieving the death of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, who passed away this morning. In an extraordinary meeting held today, the Cabinet announced official mourning for a period of 40 days and the closure of official departments for three days, while the Kuwait Municipality announced the lowering of flags at half-mast for 40 days in all ministries' buildings, government agencies, and main roads.

Since the morning of November 24, 1961, the country's flag has been flying on its flagpoles, buildings, and institutions, even though the law stipulates that the national flag must be officially raised starting on the morning of January 1, 1962. That flag was not lowered except during periods when the country witnessed the death of one of its honorable rulers from the Al-Sabah family, namely the late His Highness the Amir Sheikh Abdullah Al-Salem Al-Sabah, the late His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Salem Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, the late His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sadah Al-Abdullah Al-Salem Al-Sabah, and the late His Highness the Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

Despite the crisis of the Iraqi invasion and the months of occupation that the country experienced between August 2, 1990, and February 26, 1991, the Kuwaiti flag remained raised in homes, remaining in the souls as a symbol of freedom and independence after the Iraqi forces resorted to burning

flags raised in public and private places. The flag is considered a national symbol that carries certain connotations and expresses specific meanings that remain eternal over the years and are passed down through generations.

Although each country has its own constitution, laws, and specific signs that express and indicate them, the flag remains the most expressive and used symbol to represent the country in international forums. The flag of Kuwait has great importance in representing the country through its embassies and consulates abroad, in addition to its presence among the flags of countries around the world on the United Nations building and the buildings of regional and international organizations and institutions in which Kuwait participates.

Article two of Law 26 of 1961 regarding the Kuwaiti flag stipulates that the flag be raised over government buildings in Kuwait and on ships that carry Kuwaiti nationality. As for Article 4 of the same law, it stipulates that the flag be flown at half-mast in cases of official mourning being declared in the country.

## Institutions close

Meanwhile, the Civil Service Commission (CSC) announced Saturday that ministries and government institutions would close for three days as of Sunday following the passing away of HH the Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. It was added in a statement that work would resume on Wednesday, December 20. Meanwhile, the Ministry of Education said tests for secondary school would be postponed

for justice wholeheartedly, no matter how many people were against it.

On his part, Khaled, a young Kuwaiti, said: "My heart aches for the loss of the Amir, for he was not just a leader, but also a father figure to all of us. His kindness and compassion touched the hearts of every Kuwaiti citizen. Also, his presence in both the interior and defense ministries made him an integral part of Kuwait's political landscape," he said. Khaled's father Abdulhadi further elaborated on Sheikh Nawaf's commitment to upholding the humanitarian values that Kuwait is known for. According to him, the Amir left a profound impact on the lives of Kuwaitis.


Abu Abdullah, an Indian expat, expressed his emotions on the passing of the Amir: "I am very saddened by the passing of our beloved Amir, as he did a lot for the country throughout his life in the various positions he held." He highlighted his building of Belal bin Rabah Mosque, noting he didn't attribute its name to himself, but attributed it to one of the companions of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), which is a great reflection of how a modest ruler he was.

Speaking of Belal bin Rabah Mosque, Hesham, an Egyptian expat in his early 60s, spoke of his personal grief of losing the late Amir, as he shared a special memory with him. "I'll never forget how he humbly prayed among us in his local mosque without his guards. I will always pray for his soul to rest in peace every time I visit it." He added how Sheikh Nawaf fought against corruption, and how all residents of Kuwait, despite their differences, can agree that his rule was marked by grace and integrity.

Shaimaa, a middle-aged Egyptian resident, described how Sheikh Nawaf was one of his kind, as he never practiced racism or oppression against any nationality. Not once in her life did she hear someone speaking negatively about him, as everyone unconditionally praised his manners and his gentle personality. She explained he was a very eloquent person too, and even though his words were concise as he chose them very carefully, they never failed to deeply reach everyone nevertheless.





# Three Gaza hostages killed by Zionist forces waved white flag

# Funeral held for Al-Jazeera journalist killed by Zionists • Gaza pounding continues

day that three hostages mistakenly killed by soldiers carried a white flag and cried for help in Hebrew. Yotam Haim, Alon Shamriz and Samer El-Talalqa—all in their 20s—were shot during operations in Gaza City on Friday, sparking protests in Zionist entity.

They were among about 250 people taken hostage during Palestinian militant group Hamas's October 7 attacks in Zionist entity. Zionist army spokesman Daniel Hagari said that during fighting in the Shejaiya district of Gaza City, troops "mistakenly identified three Zionist entity hostages as a threat and as a result, fired toward them and the hostages were killed". An army official said the hostages were all "without shirts" and had "a stick with a white cloth on it", but a soldier felt threatened and opened fire. "Two are killed immediately, one is injured and runs back into the building," the official said, adding that the soldiers heard "a cry for help... in Hebrew".

Meanwhile, dozens of journalists took part in a funeral on Saturday for an Al-Jazeera cameraman killed in a Zionist entity strike in the south of the war-torn Gaza Strip. Samer Abu Daqqa's body, bearing his bullet-proof vest and helmet, was carried through a crowd in the city of Khan Yunis before being buried in a grave dug by fellow journalists. His mother Umm Maher Abu Daqqa accused Zionists of targeting journalists, "especially those working for Al-Jazeera".

Abu Daqqa, born in 1978, was reporting from a school in Khan Yunis when he was hit by a drone strike on Friday, said the Qatar-based Al-Jazeera television network. His colleague, Gaza bureau chief Wael Al-Dahdouh, was wounded in the same attack. Dahdouh had lost his wife and two children in a separate Zionist strike in the initial weeks of the war.

Despite a ceasefire order, "there's another burst of fire towards the third figure and he also dies." The official called it a "tragic" event and "very hard day", but said the troops had faced "intense combat in the area". Hundreds were expected to gather Saturday in Tel Aviv to call on Netanyahu's government to secure the release of 129 hostages still held in the Hamas-ruled Gaza Strip. "I am dying of fear," said

JERUSALEM: The Zionist entity's army said Satur- Meray Svirsky, sister of hostage Itay Svirsky at a protest on Friday. "We demand a deal now."

In November, a one-week truce saw more than 100 hostages freed in exchange for Palestinians held in Zionist entity jails, but fighting has since resumed. The hostages' deaths have heightened already fierce scrutiny of how Zionist entity is conducting its ground and air assault in Gaza. The White House, which provides billions of dollars in military aid to Zionist entity, has voiced growing concern over civilian deaths. "I want them to be focused on how to save civilian lives-not stop going after Hamas, but be more careful," US President Joe Biden said this week. News platform Axios said the director of Zionist entity intelligence agency Mossad, David Barnea, was due to meet this weekend in an unspecified location in Europe with Qatari Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al-Thani, who helped negotiate the earlier truce.

In Gaza, fierce fighting continued. The Zionist entity army said Saturday it had raided two schools in Gaza City. It said they were Hamas hiding places. A funeral was held in Gaza for Samer Abu Daqqa, a journalist with TV network Al-Jazeera killed the previous day by a Zionist entity strike in Khan Yunis that also wounded his colleague, Wael Al-Dahdouh. "He died hungry, they died with nothing to eat, with hunger. Oh my darling," said his grieving mother, Umm Maher.

More than 60 journalists and media staff have died since the war began, according to the Committee to Protect Journalists. "We were reporting, we were filming, we had finished and we were with the civil defense, but when we were on the way back, they hit us with a missile," said Dahdouh, who lost his wife, two children and grandchild earlier in the war. In the face of growing international pressure, Zionist entity announced a "temporary measure" allowing aid to be delivered directly to Gaza through the Kerem Shalom border crossing. A World Health Organization representative said the decision was "very good news". Since the war began, aid has trickled into Gaza through the Rafah crossing with Egypt. Humanitarian agencies have said the volume is just a

fraction of what is needed to help the estimated 1.9 million Gazans displaced by the war. Washington hopes the Palestinian Authority can resume control of Gaza as part of a renewed push for a two-state solution to the Zionist entity-Palestinian conflict—a solution that Netanyahu has resolutely opposed. The conflict has appeared to push any peace deal further out of view. Multiple Western governments issued a joint statement demanding that Zionist entity "take concrete steps to halt unprecedented violence by Zionist entity settlers" in the West Bank. More than 280 Palestinians have been killed by Zionist entity forces or settlers in the West Bank since the war in

Gaza erupted. Zionist entity's police force said it had suspended several officers after they severely assaulted a journalist for Turkish news agency Anadolu as he was trying to take photos of Palestinians praying in annexed east Jerusalem.

And on Saturday eight Palestinians were arrested across the West Bank during Zionist entity raids, according to Palestinian news agency Wafa. The war continues to be felt across the Middle East, with fears of a new front opening on Zionist entity's northern border with Lebanon, where it has exchanged regular fire with militants, mainly the powerful Hezbollah. — AFP

# Iran executes man convicted of spying for Zionist entity

TEHRAN: Iran on Saturday executed a man who was sentenced to death after being convicted of working with Zionist entity's intelligence services, the judiciary said.

'The death sentence was carried out this morning against a spy of the Zionist regime in Zahedan prison" in the southeastern province of Sistan-Baluchistan, the judiciary's Mizan Online website said. It did not identify the man but said he had been convicted of "intelligence cooperation and espionage for the benefit for the hostile Zionist regime (Zionist entity)".

He was also found guilty of "collecting and providing classified information to the Mossad spy service with the aim of disrupting public order", Mizan added. It was not immediately clear when or where the man was arrested or put on trial. Iran has previously announced the arrests of alleged agents working for foreign countries, including Zionist entity, its regional arch-foe. In December 2022, the Islamic republic hanged four people who had been convicted of collaborating with Zionist entity's intelligence services.

Iran does not recognize Zionist entity and the two countries have engaged in a shadow war for years. Tehran accuses Zionist entity of carrying out a wave of sabotage attacks and assassinations targeting its nuclear program. The United States and Zionist entity accuse Iran of using drones and missiles to attack US forces and Zionist entity-linked ships in the Gulf. According to human rights groups, including Amnesty International, Iran executes more people per year than any other nation except China. — AFP

# Two migrants dead in attempted Channel crossings: France

CALAIS: Two migrants died as they attempted to cross the Channel in two separate incidents, French authorities said on Friday. The first migrant—a man aged 30 to 35 — died overnight Thursday to Friday off the coast of Gravelines as an overcrowded inflatable boat capsized, regional prosecutors said. The boat was carrying 50 men, seven women and two children. Two people were missing, but the search for them was called off at nightfall Friday, prosecutors said.

A man suspected of piloting the boat was arrested, prosecutors said. French sea rescue coordinators at Gris Nez, near the northern port city Calais, were warned during the night that a migrant boat was in difficulty less than eight kilometers (five miles) from the coast. A rescue vessel arrived in the area at around 30 minutes past midnight (2330 GMT), maritime authorities said.

After the crew found one of the migrant boat's buoyancy tubes "deflated" and people "in the water", they brought everyone they could find back to Calais. In a separate incident, the body of a migrant was found on a beach in Sangatte on Friday morning after an aborted crossing attempt, according to a police source.

The victim was probably Sudanese, the source said. The exact cause of death was not yet known, said the Boulogne-sur-Mer public prosecutor's office, which opened an investigation into "involuntary manslaughter". According to the prosecutors, "a group of 70 migrants went to sea in a 'small boat', but the boat returned to the beach" around 7 am. — AFP

# West urges Zionist entity to halt settler violence

PARIS/RAMALLAH: Western nations and the European Union Friday urged Zionist entity to "take concrete steps to halt unprecedented violence by Zionist entity settlers in the occupied West Bank," in a joint statement published by France's foreign ministry. The call from Australia, Britain, Canada, France, the European Union and several other European countries—but notably excluding Germany and the United States—highlighted "an unprecedented number of attacks perpetrated by extremist settlers" since early October that they said had claimed eight Palestinian lives and wounded 83 people.

Reiterating that Zionist entity's settlement policy "is illegal under international law," the signatories of Friday's statement said that "as the occupying power, Zionist entity must protect Palestinian civilians in the West Bank" and 'bring those responsible for this violence to justice". Friday's statement comes days after EU chief Ursula von der Leyen backed imposing sanctions on "extremist" Zionist entity settlers—although not all of the bloc's 27 nations agree. While some members such as Spain have sharply criticized Zionist entity's response to Hamas' attack, others including Germany stand firmly behind the state.

More than 280 Palestinians have been killed by Zionist entity forces or settlers in the West Bank since the war in Gaza erupted on October 7, health officials say. Over the same period, more than 18,700 people have been killed in the Zionist entity offensive on Gaza, according to the health ministry in the Hamas-run besieged Palestinian territory.

# Ukraine says shot down 30 drones in new attack

KYIV: The Ukrainian air force said Saturday that it had repelled a Russian drone attack overnight, shooting down 30 of 31 drones launched by Mos-

The attack targeted regions including the capital Kyiv, the southern region of Kherson as well as the western Khmelnytsky region. "A total of 31 Shahed-136/131 attack drones were used in the attack, which the occupiers sent to different region of Ukraine," the Ukrainian air force said in a statement.

Kherson was recaptured by Ukrainian forces in November 2022 but has since faced relentless shelling by Russian forces from the opposite bank of the adjoining Dnipro river. Meanwhile Russian authorities reported that one person had died in overnight Ukrainian bombings on the occupied southern Kherson region. The governor of the Russian region of Belgorod, Vyacheslav Gladkov, reported that there had been 41 Ukrainian strikes in the last 24 hours on the territory, which borders Ukraine.

Russia said Friday that it had thwarted a series of Ukrainian drone attacks in two border regions. Over a two-hour period, 26 drones were shot down over the Crimea peninsula annexed from Ukraine in 2014, the defence ministry said in a statement, without saying if there were any victims or damage. Earlier, the ministry said in posts on Telegram that six drones targeting "installations on Russian territory" were shot down in the Kursk region, again without providing further details.

Drone attacks have been almost daily occurrences in Russia's border regions, though mass attacks are less common. Russia, meanwhile, bombards Ukrainian towns almost daily. This week, it launched a

Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas said Gaza was an "integral part" of the Palestinian state during talks with a top US official at his West Bank headquarters Friday, his office said. The meeting came as Zionist entity pressed its offensive in Gaza despite mounting international calls for restraint, with key backer the United States saying the

war must not lead to a long-term Zionist entity occupation of the territory. Abbas told visiting US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan that "Gaza is an integral part of the State of Palestine", his office said in a statement, adding that "the president underscored that separation or any attempt to isolate any part of it is unacceptable". — AFP

Meanwhile, a Ukrainian missile attack on a Russian-held village in southern Ukraine killed two people, Moscow's occupying authorities in the Kherson region said on Saturday. Moscow's forces said the missile hit the village of Nova Mayachka, on the Russian-occupied bank of the Dnipro river and located some 70 kilometers (40 miles) east of the Ukrainianheld city of Kherson. "Two civilians were killed. Two other (civilians) were wounded," Moscow-appointed official Vladimir Saldo said.

A US-made HIMARS missile hit in the village of Nova Mayachka "during the delivery of humanitarian aid", according to Saldo. Other missiles, which he said were launched by Kyiv, had been downed by air defense. Military personnel helping to deliver the aid had also been wounded.

"The wounded have been given the necessary medical help and emergency services are working at the scene," he said. Moscow's offensive in Ukraine has dragged on for nearly two years. The front has barely moved in southern and eastern Ukraine for months. — AFP

# Japan, ASEAN to boost maritime security ties with eye on China

# Tokyo to push energy cooperation with AZEC meeting

**TOKYO:** Southeast Asian and Japanese leaders will agree to boost "maritime security cooperation", according to a draft statement seen by AFP from a summit that kicked off Saturday against the backdrop of growing tensions in the South China Sea. China claims almost the entire waterway, a vital trade corridor, and its increasingly aggressive behavior in disputed areas has riled nations across the region as well as Washington. Close US ally Japan, which also has competing territorial claims with China, is upping its military spending and has already boosted security cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region, including with South Korea and Australia.

According to the draft of the weekend summit's final statement, Japan and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) will commit to "(strengthen) security cooperation, including maritime security cooperation". Japan on Wednesday expressed "serious concern" about "dangerous actions" after the latest tense confrontation between Philippine and Chinese vessels at flashpoint reefs that included a collision and Chinese ships shooting water cannon.

Tokyo added that it "concurs with the Philippines' long-standing objections to unlawful maritime claims, militarization, coercive activities and threat or use of force in the South China Sea".

Japan last month agreed to help the Philippines—whose President Ferdinand Marcos was due in Tokyo—buy coastguard vessels and to supply a radar system, and the two are discussing allowing troop deployments on each other's soil. With Malaysia, Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said on Saturday that he had agreed with counterpart Anwar Ibrahim to deepen strategic ties and provide 400 million yen (\$2.8 million) for "warning and surveillance" equipment.

Kishida said that with the world "at a historical turning point, Japan places great importance on promoting cooperation with ASEAN, including Malaysia, to maintain and strengthen a free and open international order based on the rule of law and to ensure a world where human dignity is protected".

Malaysia, along with the Philippines, Vietnam, Brunei and Taiwan, have overlapping claims in the South China Sea.

In September, militaries from ASEAN nations held their first-ever joint exercises, although host Indonesia insisted they were non-combat drills, focusing on areas such as disaster relief and maritime patrols. Asked about the ASEAN summit, China's foreign ministry said Friday that Beijing "believed that any cooperation should be conducive to advancing mutual trust among regional countries and promoting common development".

"We hope that relevant countries can truly do things conducive to regional peace and stability. At the same time, any cooperation should not target third parties," spokeswoman Mao

Ning told a regular briefing.

Japan is also expected to use the summit to push energy cooperation, with a meeting of its Asian Zero Emission Community (AZEC) initiative scheduled for Monday that will be attended virtually by Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, officials said.

Tokyo is boosting its renewables sector but has also come under fire from environmental groups for providing large-scale public financing for fossil fuel projects around Asia.

Japan has also been seeking to push the export of tech aimed at reducing emissions by coal plants, such as co-firing with ammonia and carbon capture. But critics say these methods are unproven and expensive.

"This push to lock in fossil fuel-based energy across the continent is delaying the transition from fossil fuels to renewables," the Climate Action Network said this month. Ammonia "fails to meaningfully reduce emissions, jeopardises the decarbonization

of Japan's energy and any possibility of phasing out fossil fuels", it said.

ASEAN's 10 member states are Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and Myanmar. The summit marks 50 years of ties with Japan. While Myanmar is a member, the leaders of its junta have been banned from the bloc's high-level meetings since failing to implement an agreed five-point peace plan following the 2021 coup in which they took power. — AFP

## DR Congo's democracy backsliding ahead of vote, say rights groups

KINSHASA: DR Congo's democracy has been backsliding ahead of elections this month, according to rights defenders, as prominent journalists languish in prison and the murder of an opposition politician remains unsolved. President Felix Tshisekedi came to power in 2019 after a campaign criticizing the rights record of his predecessor Joseph Kabila, among other issues.

But a slew of recent events have sparked concerns about the president's own record. A former minister turned opposition member was found dead in the central African nation's capital Kinshasa in July. A few months later, one the best-known Congolese journalists was imprisoned after the authorities accused him of spreading fake news about the murder.

"These are signs of the narrowing of the democratic space," said a rights researcher, who requested anonymity. The Democratic Republic of Congo is scheduled to hold elections on December 20. Tshisekedi, 60, will be running for a second term.

Human Rights Watch warned Saturday that it had documented clashes and other violence between supporters of rival parties that could undermine the vote. "Political parties and candidates should publicize their anti-violence stance and help ensure that people have the opportunity to vote for the candidates of their choice," said HRW researcher Thomas Fessy.

Tshisekedi released hundreds of political prisoners when he first took office, but initial optimism began to fade after intimidation of critics started again in 2020. Opposition members regularly say they are harassed, and point to arrests they claim are politically motivated.

Despite its mineral riches, DRC is one of the poorest nations of the world, and has a history of autocratic rule. Floribert Anzuluni, a presidential candidate and former rights activist, told AFP that repression often spikes around elections.

"It's the case today, there's a hardening of the democratic space," he said.

In a high-profile case in May, Congolese military intelligence arrested Salomon Idi Kalonda, a close advisor to opposition presidential contender Moise Katumbi. Kalonda was accused of colluding with M23 rebels in the country's east, as well as the group's alleged backers, Rwanda. His trial is ongoing.

A month later, the body of Cherubin Okende, a former transport minister and Katumbi ally, was

found riddled with bullets in Kinshasa. The government has condemned the killing and opened an investigation. But several analysts say the investigation

"The justice system seems not to be doing its job," Anzuluni said. In September, the prominent Congolese journalist Stanis Bujakera, who works for Reuters and Jeune Afrique magazine, was arrested on suspicion of spreading false information about Okende's killing. His arrest followed a Jeune Afrique article -- which was not bylined—that suggested that Congolese military intelligence had assassinated Okende. The article was based on a memo that the Congolese authorities have said is fake.

Bujakera remains in prison with the trial ongoing. Eric Nsenga, who works on human rights for ECC, a federation of Congolese protestant churches, said Bujakera's arrest "sends an image of intimidation".

Bujakera's case attracted an outpouring of international criticism. But rights defenders say arrests of lesser-known figures have gone unnoticed. Human Rights Watch said last week that opposition member Lens Omelonga had been freed after seven months in detention. He had shared a social-media post criticizing the foundation of the president's wife Denise Tshisekedi.

Fred Bauma, the executive director of Kinshasa-based think-tank Ebuteli, said repression had long gone under the radar—especially in the east, where he highlighted cases of protesters detained arbitrarily. In 2021, Tshisekedi placed two eastern provinces under martial law in a bid to curb militia violence.

But the policy has mostly failed, and has been criticized for facilitating a crackdown on dissent. The president promised to roll it back after an elite army unit, in late August, massacred over 50 members of a religious sect who were planning a protest in the eastern city of Goma.

The government condemned the massacre, and a military court handed down prison sentences to several officers involved. But several rights defenders told AFP they were frustrated with the accumulation of such cases, and apparent government impunity.

"They've been able to trick a lot of the international community," said one, accusing the government of saying the right things on the diplomatic stage but rarely following up. One UN official agreed that there was little international will to confront abuses, saying "There's fatigue when it comes to the DRC". A government spokesman was not immediately available for comment. – AFP

The lead-up to the self-ruled island's January 13 poll is being closely watched—including by policymakers in Beijing and Washington—as it could determine the future of Taiwan's relations with an increasingly bellicose China.

# Founder of China's SenseTime, AI scientist dies

BEIJING: The founder of leading Chinese AI firm SenseTime and an influential computer scientist has suddenly passed away, the company said in a statement Saturday. "It is with an extremely heavy heart that we announce to everyone the sorrowful news: Our beloved founder... Tang Xiao'ou, due to illness that could not be treated, left us forever at 23:45 on December 15. 2023," SenseTime said in an online post.

Tang, an alumnus of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and former professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong who founded SenseTime in

The specific cause of the renowned computer scientist's death was not stated. SenseTime was placed on a US trade blacklist in 2019, accused of being an arm of China's "military-industrial complex" over the use of its technology in mass surveillance in the western region of Xinjiang.

In December 2021, the firm's initial public offering in Hong Kong was delayed after it came under new restrictions by the US for related accusations, although it successfully listed on the exchange before the year ended.

SenseTime hailed Tang in its Saturday statement as "an outstanding representative in (China's) AI field", calling him "knowledgeable, rigorous in scholarship, truth-seeking and pragmatic". "The company mission he formulated, to 'insist on originality and let AI lead human progress' will inspire all SenseTime people," the firm said. Tang had extensive experience in American academia, earning a PhD from MIT in 1996 after completing an MSc at the University of Rochester in 1991. — AFP

# Mother of 6-yr-old US boy who shot teacher sentenced to 2 years

WASHINGTON: A Virginia woman whose six-year-old son shot and severely wounded his teacher was sentenced to two years in prison on Friday. Deja Taylor's son brought her gun to school in the southern US state on January 6 and shot his elementary school teacher. The teacher was hospitalized for two weeks with

injuries to her hand and chest. The 26-year-old Taylor was sentenced to 21 months in prison in November after pleading guilty to illegally obtaining the firearm and making a false statement on a government form required to purchase the weapon. Taylor had claimed, falsely, on the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives form that she did not consume illegal drugs. Newport News Circuit Court Judge Christopher Papile sentenced Taylor on Friday to an additional two years in prison for felony child neglect. The two-year prison sentence is to be served after Taylor completes the 21-month sentence.

Amid a huge number of deadly firearms incidents involving young people, pressure has been mounting in the United States to punish parents who make it possible for their children to get weapons. The father of an Illinois man accused of

# Shipping firms suspend Red Sea traffic after Yemen rebel strikes

Strategic route for Gulf oil and natural gas shipments remains under threat

**DUBAI:** Two of the world's largest shipping firms, Maersk and Hapag-Lloyd, said Friday they were suspending passage through a Red Sea strait vital for global commerce, after Yemeni rebel attacks in the area.

The Iran-backed Houthis, who control much of Yemen but are not recognized internationally, say they're targeting shipping to pressure Zionist entity during its two-month-old war with Palestinian Hamas militants in the Gaza Strip. The maritime tensions have added to fears that the Gaza conflict could spread.

German transport company Hapag-Lloyd said it was halting Red Sea container ship traffic until December 18, after the Houthis attacked one of its vessels. "Hapag-Lloyd is interrupting all container ship traffic across the Red Sea until Monday," the company said in a statement sent to AFP.

The Danish firm Maersk made a similar announcement, a little earlier. "We have instructed all Maersk vessels in the area bound to pass through the Bab Al-Mandab Strait to pause their journey until further notice," it said. Maersk said this followed a "near-miss incident involving Maersk Gibraltar yesterday" as well as Friday's attack, in which the rebels struck a Hapag-Lloyd cargo ship in the Red Sea.

A US defense official identified it as the Liberia-flagged Al-Jasrah, a 368-metre (1,207-foot) container ship built in 2016. "We are aware that something launched from a Houthi-controlled region of Yemen struck this vessel which was damaged, and there was a report of a fire," the official told AFP, speaking on condition of anonymity so that he could discuss intelligence matters. The US Central Command in the Middle East (CENT-COM) confirmed on X, formerly Twitter, that "a UAV" I struck the Al-Jasrah causing a fire that was successfully extinguished.

#### Vessel seized

A Hapag-Lloyd spokesman told AFP: "There has been an attack on one of our ships." It was en route from the Greek port of Piraeus to Singapore. There were no casualties and the ship was travelling onward to its destination, he added. Later in the day during a pro-Palestinian rally in the Yemeni capital, Sanaa, the rebels said they attacked two other ships in the area.

"Container ships MSC Palatium and MSC Alanya were targeted by two naval missiles as they were heading toward the Zionist entity," Houthi military

spokesman Yahya Saree said in a broadcast on the rebels' television channel. The rebels said that, in an earlier attack, the Maersk Gibraltar vessel was "targeted with a drone and the hit was direct". According to a US official, the missile missed.

Saree said the attack came after the ship's crew "refused to respond to the calls of the Yemeni naval services", and that it was intended as retaliation for the "oppression of the Palestinian people". CENTCOM said that the MSC Alanya was only threatened but not struck, while the Palatium was hit by one of two ballistic missiles fired. In a statement posted December 9 on social media, the Houthis said they "will prevent the passage" of ships heading to Zionist entity—regardless of ownership—if food and medicine are not allowed into besieged, Hamas-ruled Gaza.

On Tuesday, they claimed responsibility for a missile strike on a Norwegian-flagged tanker. Last month, they seized a Zionist entity-linked cargo vessel, the Galaxy Leader, and its 25 international crew members. Germany's Foreign Minister Annalena Baerbock on Friday said the Houthi attacks "endanger not only Zionist entity's security" but also international shipping routes.

#### Oil, gas route

Asked at a press conference in Oslo about the potential for broader conflict after the Houthi attacks, Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan said: "Our region is very complex and we do not need any other conflicts to erupt." A Saudi-led military coalition has for years backed the Yemeni government against the Houthis, but a United Nations-brokered ceasefire has largely held since expiring over a year ago. Iran's Defense Minister Mohammad-Reza Ashtiani warned on Wednesday against the possible deployment of multinational forces in the Red Sea, which he said would lead to "extraordinary problems", the ISNA news agency said. The attack on the Al-Jasrah occurred near Bab al-Mandab, the narrow strait between Yemen and northeast Africa through which around 20,000 ships pass annually. The area leads to the Red Sea, Zionist entity's southern port facilities and the Suez Canal, making it part of a strategic route for Gulf oil and natural gas shipments. The Houthis have declared themselves part of the "axis of resistance" of Iran-affiliated groups. Western warships are patrolling the area and have shot down Houthi missiles and drones several times. – AFP

# Soaring inflation forces Turkey CB chief to move in with parents

**ISTANBUL:** The new head of Turkey's central bank said she has been priced out of Istanbul's property market by rampant inflation, leaving no choice for the former finance executive but to move back in with her parents.

"We haven't found a home in Istanbul. It's terribly expensive. We've moved in with my parents," 44-year-old Hafize Gaye Erkan, who took up her post in June after two decades in the United States, told the Hurriyet newspaper. Erkan previously worked at firms including Goldman Sachs and First Republic Bank—and is now getting a crash course in the soaring prices that have seen many young people struggling to find lodgings.

"Is it possible that Istanbul has gotten more expensive than Manhattan?" she said. Year-on-year inflation stood at 61 percent in November as President Recep Tayyip Erdogan has allowed the lira currency to weak-

en while promising that a new team of economists with Wall Street experience would tackle years of economic crisis. To quell growing anger, officials also capped rent increases at 25 percent—though experts say that has only amplified the housing tensions, as owners try to push out occupants, sometimes fraudulently, in order to set new and higher rents. The central bank last month pushed up benchmark lending rates to 40 percent in a bid to get inflation under control. "We're nearing the end of our monetary tightening measures," Erkan told the paper. — AFP

# Coal use hits record in 2023, Earth's hottest year, says IEA

# Worldwide coal consumption expected to start declining in 2024

PARIS: Global consumption of coal reached an all-time high in 2023, the IEA energy watchdog said Friday, as Earth experienced its hottest recorded year. The International Energy Agency reported that nations would burn even more coal this year than in 2022, the previous record for consumption of the key source of planet-warming gases.

Scientists say greenhouse gases will need to be cut almost in half this decade to meet the world's targets of limiting global heating and avoiding catastrophic impacts on the Earth's climate. The EU's Copernicus Climate Change Service said earlier in December that 2023 will be the hottest on record after November became the sixth record-breaking month in a row.

The IEA said, nevertheless, that after peaking this year, worldwide coal consumption was expected to start declining in 2024, as renewable power generation from solar and wind continues to expand. Its latest forecasts were published two days after the conclusion of the United Nations climate negotiations (COP28) in Dubai—where nearly 200 countries reached a deal that the world should be "transitioning away from fossil fuels" to limit global warming.

It was the first time in the 28-year history of the annual climate negotiations that all fossil fuels were mentioned in an accord. The disruption in the Earth's climate has contributed to an increase in the intensity and frequency of storms, droughts and lethal wildfires around the world.

#### Asia powering coal use

The IEA said consumption of coal, the dirtiest fossil fuel, rose by 1.4 percent in 2023 to a record 8.5 billion tons, as increases in China, India and Indo-

nesia outweighed sharply falling demand in Europe and the United States, the IEA said. "We expect to see a trend emerging of declining worldwide coal demand, starting in 2024," the Paris-based energy watchdog said, as renewable power generation from solar and wind continues to expand. The appetite for coal is strongest in Asia, it said. Consumption in China alone grew by 220 million tons or 4.9 percent in 2023, while in India it grew eight percent and in Indonesia by 11 percent. Elsewhere, coal use fell 23 percent or by 107 million tons in Europe, while in the United States it dropped 95 million tons or by 21 percent, largely due to weakening industrial activity and an ongoing shift away from coal-fired generation towards renewables.

The IEA said it was difficult to forecast demand in Russia, currently the fourth-largest coal consumer, because of the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, and forecasts for Ukraine were equally uncertain. While the IEA predicted a decline in coal in power stations, it said its use in heavy industries like cement production was expected to continue at high levels. Paradoxically, the high demand for coal in Indonesia's mining sector stems from its booming industry in extracting and refining nickel for use in electric car batteries. China remains the world's largest user of coal, responsible for half (54 percent) of all coal burned worldwide. More than 60 percent of coal burned in China is used to generate electricity and the country continues to build coal-fired power stations.

This year alone, the country has approved new projects totalling 52 gigawatts of new electricity-generating capacity. The IEA nevertheless expects coal consumption in China to start declining, unless heatwaves and very cold spells lead to



higher demand on its power plants.

Burning coal to generate electricity would decline in China to 2.8 billion tons, a drop of 175 million, over the period 2024-26. In its place, the main demand for coal would come from India, at least as far as 2026, the IEA said. In the European Union, an expansion of

renewable energies, which generate very little greenhouse gas emissions, is curbing demand for coal. In Germany, the use of ignite- and coal-powered power stations is expected to tail off significantly by 2025, the watchdog forecast, as solar and wind farms come on stream. — AFP

# EU reaches deal to reform bloc's electricity market

BRUSSELS: The European Union reached an agreement on Thursday to reform the bloc's electricity market in a bid to reduce dependence on fossil fuels and stabilize consumer prices, the EU Council said in a statement. "Today, the Council and the Parliament reached a provisional agreement to reform the EU's electricity market design (EMD)," said a statement released by the presidency of the Council of the EU, currently held by Spain.

"The reform aims to make electricity prices less dependent on volatile fossil fuel prices, shield consumers from price spikes, accelerate the deployment of renewable energies and improve consumer protection." The EU's plans are aimed at making the market less vulnerable to volatility and were seen as a response to Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which sent energy prices spiraling for consumers and businesses last year.

"This deal is great news, as it will help us reduce even more the EU's dependence on Russian gas and boost fossil-free energy to cut greenhouse gas emissions," said Teresa Ribera, Spain's energy minister.

The deal will have to be endorsed and adopted by both the Council and the Parliament. Part of wider reforms, the deal also includes a regulation that will improve the EU's protection against market manipu-

# Uranium price hits highest level in almost 17 years

**NEW YORK:** The price of uranium reached the highest level for almost 17 years on Friday, driven by constrained supply and accelerating demand, against a backdrop of renewed interest in nuclear power.

The benchmark contract for uranium oxide which, once enriched, is used as nuclear fuel, rose to \$85.75 a pound (around 450 grams) for the first time since January 2007.

This price rise is the result of a combination of factors, notably the rebound in demand due to renewed interest in nuclear power, but also due to fears about oil and gas supplies following Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The higher prices will cause headaches for countries that rely heavily on nuclear energy, such as France, which generated almost 70 percent of its

electricity from nuclear power in 2021, according to the US Energy Information Administration.

France, along with Belgium, the UK and Romania recently authorized the extension of the operation of several existing power plants. In the United States, California's public utilities commission (CPUC) approved a five-year extension on Thursday to the lifespan of two reactors close to Los Angeles, which were originally scheduled to close in 2024 and 2025.

New projects have also been launched, particularly in China, where 25 reactors are under construction—as well as in India, Turkey and Egypt. Demand for nuclear power has been rising, but "the supply has not really responded," according to Jonathan Hinze, president of nuclear industry research firm UxC. This is particularly true in Kazakhstan, which is the world's largest uranium producer by far, accounting for 43 percent of global production last year, according to the World Nuclear Association (WNA).

Kazakhstan has faced logistical problems, in particular a shortage of the sulfuric acid used for extraction, Hinze told AFP. Some 58,000 tons of uranium were extracted worldwide in 2022, according to

the WNA. The financial markets are also concerned by the recent military coup in Niger, a country responsible for four percent of uranium production worldwide last year, Hinze said.

In another move likely to squeeze prices, the Republican-led US House of Representatives voted on Monday to ban uranium imports from Russia, which is responsible for five percent of global production. The bill still has to pass the Democratic-controlled Senate.

All of these factors are compounded by the emergence of financial players who have amassed large reserves of uranium and driven up prices. The biggest of these is Canada's Sprott, which controlled almost 28,000 tons of the precious ore at the end of June. To supply the growing demand for uranium, old mines are being reopened around the world in places like the US state of Utah.

"The demand for uranium will remain strong and grow," said Hinze from UxC, adding that it was not possible to ramp up supply overnight. As a result, "if anything, the price will go up further, not down," in the medium term, he said. — AFP

# What is Storm-1152, top creator of fake Microsoft accounts?

SEOUL: Microsoft has seized the websites of a Vietnam-based group it alleges sold millions of fake accounts to cybercriminals who used them for ransomware attacks, identity theft and other scams around the world. The group, identified by Microsoft as Storm-1152, developed sophisticated tools to defeat the US tech giant's security features to set up fraudulent Outlook and Hotmail email accounts in bulk.

## Who is in Storm-1152?

Storm-1152 was first detected in 2021. Arkose Labs, the cybersecurity firm that worked with Microsoft against the group, tracked it to Vietnam. The leaders of the group are three Vietnam-based individuals, Duong Dinh Tu, Linh Van Nguyen and Tai Van Nguyen, Microsoft said in a statement on Wednesday. It is not clear if there are any other members.

AFP has asked the three for a response on email addresses listed in Microsoft's complaint against them in a US federal court last week. AFP has also contacted Vietnamese authorities for comment.

How did they make millions of accounts so rapidly? Storm-1152 developed automated software—or "bots"—to create fake accounts. These bots defeated Microsoft's safeguards, such as the CAPTCHA puzzles users have to solve to prove they are human, the tech giant said in its court filing.

Storm-1152 is "the number one seller and creator of fraudulent Microsoft accounts", creating around 750 million to date, the company said Wednesday. Microsoft's court filing included a screenshot of a Storm-1152 website that boasts the use of artificial intelligence against CAPTCHA.

The group created accounts "at a scale so large, fast, and efficient that it could have only been carried out through automated, machine-learning technology", Patrice Boffa, chief customer officer at Arkose Labs, said in a statement. Who needs so many fake email accounts? Storm-1152 pursued a model called "cyber-crime-as-a-service" or CaaS, acting as a provider to other criminal groups, Microsoft and Arkose said.

With tech companies improving their detection and deletion of fake accounts, cyber attackers need huge amounts to carry out their operations. "Instead of spending time trying to create thousands of fraudulent accounts, cybercriminals can simply purchase them from Storm-1152 and other groups," Microsoft's Amy Hogan-Burney said in a blog post. Storm-1152 allegedly made millions of dollars from the operation. What did Storm-1152's customers do with fake accounts? The group's customers have used fake email accounts for a variety of crimes, according to Microsoft and Arkose Labs.

These include phishing attacks to either steal information or insert malware on devices. Its customers have also used these accounts to install ransomware and demand payment from victims, according to Microsoft. The highest-profile customer named in Microsoft's court filing is a group known as Octo Tempest, which has been linked to a wave of cybercrimes in recent years. Octo Tempest recently launched ransomware attacks against Microsoft customers that "inflicted hundreds of millions of dollars of damage", the company said in its court filing, without naming the victims. Google and X, formerly known as Twitter, have also been hit by Storm-1152 activities, Microsoft said in the filing.

Unlike many cybercriminals that offer such services on the so-called dark web, hidden away from general users, Storm-1152's websites were on the open web. It offered its services on at least two websites, according to Microsoft, and even had step-by-step user guides. Duong Dinh Tu, one of the defendants, also had a YouTube channel with a video demonstration, and the group would edit the code for their anti-CAPTCHA software on GitHub—a Microsoft-owned internet depository for software. — AFP

#### Northampton down Toulon

PARIS: Northampton replacement lock Tom Lockett's late try grabbed the English side a dramatic 22-19 victory over three-time winners Toulon in the Champions Cup at Franklin's Gardens on Friday. The hosts moved five points clear at the top of Pool 3 after a second straight win, with Toulon left floundering at the foot of the table following their home defeat by Exeter on the opening weekend. Enzo Herve's early penalty gave Toulon the lead but tries from Tom Seabrook and England fullback George Furbank put Saints in control at half-time. Melvyn Jaminet touched down shortly after the break for Toulon, but Furbank's second try gave Northampton a 15-8 lead. The deficit was wiped out in a seven-minute spell as Herve slotted over another penalty, former Northampton second-row David Ribbans crossed his old side's line to score and Jaminet kicked a drop goal. — AFP

## Scherzer undergoes surgery

WASHINGTON: Star pitcher Max Scherzer underwent back surgery on a herniated disk and will be sidelined until mid-season 2024 for the reigning Major League Baseball champion Texas Rangers, the club announced on Friday. The 39-year-old US right-hander, a three-time winner of the Cy Young Award as best pitcher, had the surgery on Thursday, Rangers general manager Chris Young said. Obtained in a trade with the New York Mets last July, Scherzer went 4-2 with a 3.20 earned-run average and 53 strikeouts over 45 innings for the Rangers, then made three playoff starts for Texas despite struggles with back spasms as the club won its first World Series crown. It was the second title for Scherzer, who helped Washington capture the 2019 championship. Young gave no timeline for the ace hurler's return but said it would be at least June or July before he took the mound again in a game. "After returning to my off-season home in Florida, my discomfort in my back continued to get worse," Scherzer said in a statement. — AFP

## Russia slams IOC ruling

MOSCOW: Russia has criticized the International Olympic Committee (IOC) for ruling that Russian athletes can only compete in Paris next year as neutral athletes and if they do not back fighting in Ukraine. Olympic chiefs earlier this month gave the green light to the participation of Russian and Belarusian athletes at next year's Games as neutrals, outside of team events and as long as they did not actively support Moscow's large-scale military intervention in Ukraine. The IOC "announced their readiness to admit Russian and Belarusian athletes to the Paris Olympics, and then immediately mockingly announced how many of them had been admitted," Russian Olympic Committee president Stanislav Pozdnyakov said at a press conference. The IOC on making their announcement this month said International Olympic Committee there were currently only eight athletes from Russia and three from Belarus who had qualified as neutral athletes. — AFP

## Raiders romp past Chargers

LOS ANGELES: The Las Vegas Raiders ran in nine touchdowns in a 63-21 thrashing of the Los Angeles Chargers on Thursday, coming within a whisker of breaking the NFL's all-time scoring record. The Raiders, who failed to score a single point in a dismal 3-0 loss to the Minnesota Vikings on Sunday, ran riot in a one-sided clash at their Allegiant Stadium. The Raiders rattled off six unanswered touchdowns to lead 42-0 after a disastrous first half for the Chargers. Vegas kept the hammer down after the restart, running in three more touchdowns against a Chargers side struggling to readjust after confirmation of a season-ending injury to quarterback Justin Herbert earlier this week. The Raiders led 63-7 early in the fourth quarter after cornerback Jack Jones intercepted Herbert's back-up Easton Stick to stroll into the end zone for a 16-yard pick six. — AFP

# Mumbai Indians pick Pandya as IPL captain

**NEW DELHI:** Mumbai Indians have appointed star all-rounder Hardik Pandya to lead in next year's Indian Premier League season, replacing all-format India captain Rohit Sharma, who led the franchise to five title wins. Pandya, 30, returned to his former franchise Mumbai only last month in a high-profile trade after a successful two-year stint with Gujarat Titans.

Mumbai Indians said the change in leadership was a part of their future planning and thanked Rohit, the joint-most-successful captain in the tournament's history alongside Chennai Super Kings' M.S. Dhoni. "It is part of legacy building and staying true to the MI philosophy of being future-ready," Mahela Jayawardene, Mumbai's global head of performance, said in a statement late Friday.

# 'Angry' Kriechmayr edges super-G at Val Gardena

VAL GARDENA: Vincent Kriechmayr picked up the 17th World Cup victory of his career when he edged home to take the first super-G of the winter in Val Gardena on Friday. In the tightest of contests, the 32-year-old Austrian finished just 0.02 seconds ahead of compatriot Daniel Hemetsberger with the Swiss Marco Odermatt another 0.01sec further back. It marked a third victory for Kriechmayr at the Dolomites' resort following his successes in super-G in 2019 and downhill in 2022. It made up for his poor performance in Thursday's downhill when the 2021 super-G and downhill world champion slouched home in 17th.

# Tiger makes pro-am walk ahead of title hunt with son

MIAMI: Tiger Woods rejected using a golf cart in favor of walking on Friday during a pro-am round at the PNC Championship, feeling fit as he regains his form for 2024. The 15-time major winner and his 14-year-old son Charlie will play in the 36-hole PNC Championship this weekend at the Ritz-Carlton Golf Club in Orlando, Florida. Woods, who turns 48 on December 30, has struggled to walk during competitive rounds since a 2021 car crash in which he suffered severe leg injuries.

Until finishing 18th in the 20-man Hero World Challenge two weeks ago, Woods had not played since the Masters after undergoing ankle surgery last April. "I felt like I was physically fit to do it (walk), and also, walking is always better for my back," Woods said. "I just wanted to keep it loose and keep it going and we're just having so much fun, it doesn't really matter. We had a good time doing it." It will be the fourth time that Team Woods attempt to take the title against other PGA Tour stars and their family members.

# Little, Campher star as Ireland beat Zimbabwe

HARARE: Josh Little claimed a national-record six wickets for 36 and Curtis Campher hit a brisk 66 as Ireland beat Zimbabwe by four wickets on Friday to take a 1-0 lead in a one-day international series. Having won the toss and opted to bat first, Zimbabwe slumped to 70-6 before a middle-order revival led by Wellington Masakadza (40) saw the hosts all out for 166 in 42.5 overs.

WASHINGTON: Two-time NBA All-Star guard Ja Morant says he endured "horrible days" during a 25-game ban and prepares to return to the Memphis Grizzlies with a new outlook on life. Morant spoke after a Grizzlies workout on Friday after being suspended for the first 25 games of the NBA season following two social media videos showing him displaying a gun went public. "Definitely tough. Horrible days," Morant said of his ban. "But the support I had throughout this process, it definitely helped me a lot. It was pretty much all I could lean on."

The 24-year-old American, named the NBA's Most Improved Player in 2022, will be eligible to return on Tuesday when the Grizzlies play at New Orleans. "I'm just trying to come back and do whatever I can to help the team win," Morant said. "I'm not forcing a historic game my first game back. I'm just super excited to be back out there."

At 6-17, the Grizzlies are level with Portland for the fourth-worst record in the NBA and will struggle to try and reach the playoffs for a fourth consecutive season. "There's definitely some guilt in that. Obviously I'm not on the floor and nobody likes losing," Morant said. "I take full responsibility of that... The decisions I made didn't allow me to be out there, to go to battle with my team."

Morant was able to practice with his teammates but could not be in arenas when they were playing. Morant was issued an eight-game ban last March after a

It's not easy, not being out there on the floor and having to watch, but being around the team, being able to practice, being able to travel, guys talking to me and vice versa—it has been good."— AFP

# Luton's Lockyer collapses as Bournemouth clash abandoned

LONDON: Manchester City threw away a 2-0 lead at home against Crystal Palace on Saturday as the Bournemouth v Luton game was abandoned after defender Tom Lockyer collapsed on the pitch. Pep Guardiola's champions dominated their match at the Etihad but two late goals from Roy Hodgson's men, including a stoppage-time penalty, could have a major impact on the title race.

Crystal Palace have been something of a bogey team for Guardiola since he arrived in England in 2016 -- they are one of only three teams to have won at the Etihad more than once, along with Manchester United and Chelsea. The champions enjoyed nearly three-quarters of possession in the first half but had only Jack Grealish's goal to show for their dominance.

The England winger scored for the third league game in a row, sweeping home after being found by Phil Foden in the 24th minute. City had the ball in the net again early in the second half after Julian Alvarez's free-kick found the net but the goal was ruled out, with Rodri deemed to be in an offside position. However, moments later the home side did extend their lead. when Rico Lewis thumped the ball into the bottom left corner.

City seemed destined to move to within one point of Premier League leaders Liverpool but instead they collapsed in dramatic fashion. The away side scored against the run of play to give themselves hope in the 76th minute when Jeffrey Schlupp shrugged off the attentions of the City defense and crossed for Jean-Philippe Mateta to poke home. City fans faced a nervous last quarter of an hour and watched in horror when referee Paul Tierney pointed to the spot after Foden fouled Mateta. Michael Olise made no mistake, slotting home in the 95th minute and boos rang around the Etihad at the final whistle.

Game abandoned

Struggling Luton took the lead against in-form Bournemouth when Elijah Adebayo rose highest to head home a corner in the third minute but Dominic Solanke levelled just before the hour mark. But the game was halted midway through the second half as Luton's Lockyer received medical treatment after collapsing off the ball. The defender, who also collapsed during the play-off final win against Coventry in May before undergoing heart surgery, was removed from the pitch on a stretcher surrounded by the medical team, and there was a standing ovation from the crowd.

After the players were taken off, the Premier League confirmed the match had been abandoned. "The Premier League match between AFC Bournemouth and Luton Town FC has been abandoned due to a player medical incident," said a statement from the English top flight. "Our thoughts are with Tom Lockyer and all players involved in today's match.'

Chelsea returned to winning ways at Stamford Bridge against bottom club Sheffield United, winning 2-0. Cole Palmer smashed Raheem Sterling's low cross into the net in the 54th minute and he turned provider just after the hour mark as Nicolas Jackson slotted home. It was just their third Premier League home win in a tough season for the injury-ravaged team.

Newcastle claimed all three points at their St James' Park stronghold against Fulham after two consecutive league defeats. Teenager Lewis Miley found the bottom corner in the 57th minute, Miguel Almiron made it 2-0 and Dan Burn scrambled home late in the game to put the result beyond doubt. Burnley faced Everton later on Saturday, while high-flying Aston Villa and Arsenal are both in action on Sunday, when Jurgen Klopp's leaders face under-performing Manchester United. — AFP

# Lyon move out of relegation spot

MONACO: An 85th-minute winner from Jeffinho gave Lyon a 1-0 away victory against Monaco on Friday, moving the seven-times Ligue 1 champions out of the automatic relegation spots. Two minutes after entering the fray, Brazilian Jeffinho swept in his first goal of the season as Lyon won successive games for the first time this campaign to jump provisionally to 16th place in the table.

The win is just Lyon's third, and interim coach Pierre Sage's second, of the season and follows on from last Sunday's 3-0 home victory against Toulouse. "Beyond the three points, what made me smile was seeing the players happy," Sage said to Prime Video. The first half was evenly disputed with Monaco dominating the play and the chances, and the visitors looking to catch the principality side on the break.

In the second period, the home side pressed forward, with Mohamed Camara glancing a right-footed effort off the outside of the post seven minutes after the break. Captain Youssouf Fofana then dragged an effort wide just before the hour and Folarin Balogun pulled a shot narrowly past the post from the edge of the box. Anthony Lopes then came to Lyon's rescue on 67 minutes by making a fine diving save to deny Balogun after his side failed to clear a set-piece.

But the game was changed when Sage sent on Ainsley Maitland-Niles in the 72nd minute and then Jeffinho 11 minutes later. The substitutes combined with five minutes remaining when the ex-Arsenal man's cross found the Brazilian striker near the penalty spot and he beat Philipp Koehn with his first-time strike. Monaco remain third in the table and risk falling further behind leaders Paris Saint-Germain and Nice, who play away to Lille and Le Havre later in the weekend. — AFP

# Juventus miss out on top spot after Genoa draw

MILAN: Juventus failed to take top spot in Serie A from Inter Milan on Friday as Albert Gudmundsson's second-half goal secured hosts Genoa a 1-1 draw. Massimiliano Allegri's Juve closed the gap on Inter to one point but could fall four points adrift when the league leaders visit Lazio on Sunday. "When you have to kill the opponent, it has to be done, when you have important chances, you have to score," Allegri told DAZN after his team extended their unbeaten run to 11 matches. "It's an important point, let's continue the positive streak."

Juventus made a strong start and Federico Chiesa wasted a big chance midway through the first half when he fired over from close range. But the Italy international was given the chance to make amends just five minutes later from the penalty spot after a foul by goalkeeper Josep Martinez and Chiesa made no mistake. Juventus were caught out less than three minutes into the second period though as Icelandic forward Gudmundsson chested and volleved home

# Spurs bolster bid for top-4 place

NOTTINGHAM: Tottenham bolstered their renewed bid for a top-four place in the Premier League as Richarlison and Dejan Kulusevski netted in a 2-0 win against struggling Nottingham Forest on Friday. Richarlison put Ange Postecoglou's side ahead late in the first half and Kulusevski struck after the break at the City Ground. Tottenham midfielder Yves Bissouma was sent off for a dangerous tackle with 20 minutes left, but the visitors held on for their second successive victory.

The north Londoners are level on points with fourthplaced Manchester City, who host Crystal Palace in their game in hand on Saturday. After winning for the first time in six league games last weekend when they crushed Newcastle, Tottenham's confident display offered more evidence they have emerged from their autumn swoon. Saluting his opening scorer, Postecoglou said: "Richarlison is a goalmouth monster. I'm really pleased with him in training and I was confident he could do a job for us. "It's a tough game here. You have to earn whatever you get. When the ball goes out for a throw-in, you feel like you've conceded a goal." Postecoglou was less impressed with Bissouma becoming Tottenham's latest player to be sent off. "We've had to deal with that a few times this year. You can't go on like that because we'll eventually pay a price for that," he said.

"It's a fine line between commitment to what we do and not overstepping the mark." In contrast, Forest are winless in their last six games and have managed just one victory in 13 matches as the pressure mounts on boss Steve Cooper. Forest sit five points above the relegation zone, but that gap could dwindle depending on the results of their fellow strugglers this weekend. Tottenham forward Brennan Johnson was constantly jeered on his first return to Forest since his close-season transfer. Johnson's miscued cross drew an especially sarcastic cheer from the Forest fans before he nearly silenced his tormentors with a poked effort that drew a good save from Matt Turner. The Wales international's evening ended in pain after 32 minutes as he was forced off with blood pouring from a head wound, a worrying sight that finally prompted a sympathetic round of applause from the stands.

## Spurs back on track

Tottenham forward Son Heung-min was subjected to some crunching tackles as Forest tried to rattle him, but the South Korean was unfazed, whipping in a cross that Pedro Porro headed wide. Tottenham were dominating possession and they finished with a flourish in first-half stoppage time. Kulusevski's inswinging cross picked out Richarlison and, cleverly drifting away from his marker, the Brazilian rose to head home from five yards. It was Richarlison's third goal in his last two games after he had gone nearly three months without scoring.

Willy Boly squandered a golden opportunity to equalizer early in the second half when the unmarked Forest defender fired over from close-range. That was a the signal for a period of sustained Forest pressure, with Guglielmo Vicario sprawling to repel Gibbs-White's drive. Forest thought they had equalised when Anthony Elanga slotted home in the 58th minute, but the goal was disallowed by VAR for offside against the former Manchester United forward. Reinvigorated by that escape, Tottenham doubled their lead in the 65th minute thanks to Turner's catastrophe.

The Forest keeper's weak clearance only reached Kulusevski and he danced into the area before drilling a powerful shot that beat Turner's limp attempted save at the near post. Bissouma saw red in the 70th minute, dismissed for a high tackle on Ryan Yates after referee Jarred Gillett was advised to consult the pitchside monitor. Forest pressed in vain in the closing stages, with Neco Williams' deflected effort flashing just wide for a corner that forced Vicario to make a superb save from Harry Toffolo's header. — AFP

# 76ers extend GM Morey's contract

WASHINGTON: Daryl Morey, president of basketball operations for the Philadelphia 76ers, has signed a contract extension through the 2027-28 season, the NBA team announced on Friday. The 51-year-old American served as general manager of the Houston Rockets from 2007 to 2020, posting a 2019 social media message in support of Hong Kong protests that led to a major split in NBA-China relations. The day after leaving the Rockets in 2020, Morey was hired by the 76ers and since then the Sixers have won 65.3 percent of their games.

At 810-489, Morey's career 62.4 percent win percentage ranks fourth in NBA history for executives with more than 1,000 games. NBA teams directed by Morey have never suffered a losing campaign. "Daryl is one of the best front office executives in sports and I greatly value his leadership," 76ers managing partner Josh Harris said. "I'm thrilled to have reached an agreement to extend his contract and look forward to working together to maximize our chances of com-

Morey had been criticized by 76ers star guard James Harden in the off-season after a trade deal failed to materialize but last month the Sixers sent Harden to the Los Angeles Clippers in a blockbuster three-team, seven-player exchange. Sparked by reigning NBA Most Valuable Player Joel Embiid and guard Tyrese Maxey, the 76ers are 16-7, two games behind NBA overall leader Boston in the Eastern Conference and sharing the fourth-best record in the league.

"I want to express my appreciation to Josh Harris and (co-owner) David Blitzer for their unwavering support and confidence. Together, we are committed to bringing a championship to Philadelphia," Morey said. "I love this franchise and the relationship my family and I have built with our fans and this city. There's no place I'd rather continue this journey than here." The Sixers fired head coach Doc Rivers last May after they were ousted by Boston in the second round. Morev hired former Toronto coach Nick Nurse in June to guide the squad. — AFP
